School election registration OK'd

BOISE (AP) — A requirement that voters in all school elections be registered coupled with reduced voter-approval margins for some levy-increase proposals has won final legislative approval.

The Senate endorsed the House-passed measure Thursday, sending it to Gov. Cecil Andrus on a 29-13 vote. Sen. Larry Anderson, R-Twin Falls, said it would correct "some very serious inequities that developed as a result of the 1 Percent Initiative" approved in 1978 to limit property taxes.

In addition to requiring voter registration in school elections, the bill would in some cases reduce the current two-thirds supermajority requirement for passing those property tax hikes.

If the total of the proposed levy, the current plant facilities levy and any bond levies runs under two mills, or a fifth of a cent per \$100 of taxable property value, the majority needed for passage would be only 55 percent. If the total runs between two and three mills, 60 percent voter approval would be needed for passage. The two-thirds superma-

majority would remain in effect for totals including the proposed levy that run over three mills.

There was little objection to imposing the registration requirement for school elections, who now must only show they live in the applicable district before they vote. But a number of lawmakers questioned the reduction in the supermajority required to approve plant facility levies.

"We're talking about levying taxes on property," Sen. Jerry Twigg, R-Blackfoot, declared, and the supermajority "is a protection that has been built in... Until we start funding schools on a broader base than property taxes, the supermajority is a protection."

But Anderson and other backers of the bill contended that in areas where property owners have been most concerned it is because the tax levies are already high and under the bill the two-thirds majority would remain in effect in most those areas.

Senate removes barley bill assessment

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Senate has stripped from House-passed legislation expanding the Idaho Wheat Commission a mandatory two-cent-per-hundredweight tax on the state's barley growers.

On a 22-19 unrecorded vote Thursday, the majority pushed through a plan requiring the assessment to be refunded at any grower's request despite warnings that the move would undermine attempts by the proposed expanded commission to succeed in its planned barley marketing, promotion and research



refund provision. "We need to allow growers the opportunity of a refund until they understand what the program is going to do for them," Sen. Jerry Twigg, R-Blackfoot said.

But opponents of the mandatory assessment, claiming many of the state's barley growers were completely unaware of the plan, said any assessment should be subject to refund until the program is approved by growers themselves, particularly in view of the dire economic problems facing agriculture.

"Let the barley growers of the state of Idaho make the decision on whether or not the Barley Commission is good for them," Sen. C.A. Smyser, R-Parma, said.

Only two Democrats supported the refund move — Ralph Lacy of Pocatello and Jim Christiansen of Aberdeen. The Republicans joining the other Democrats in opposing it were Noh, Michael Crapo of Idaho Falls, Lynn Tominga of Rupert, John Hensen of Idaho Falls and Larry Anderson of Twin Falls.

Vote on takeover set

BOISE (AP) — The entire Idaho House will vote on a resolution which sponsors say is aimed at encouraging Idaho Power Co. to take over Utah Power and Light's customers in eastern Idaho.

The House Commerce, Industry and Tourism Committee voted 7-5 Thursday afternoon to send the measure to the floor for a vote. Opponents argued the action was premature, because Idaho Power and UP&L have not had enough time to negotiate a possible takeover.

Two eastern Idaho legislators, representatives Stan Hawkins of Ucon and Golden Linford of Rexburg, urged the committee to approve a resolution. It calls upon eastern

Idaho communities served by UP&L to hold an advisory vote whether they wanted to join the Idaho Power system.

The legislators contend Utah Power and Light electrical rates are much higher than those of Idaho Power, because UP&L gets its power from costly thermal generation and the Idaho Power system is based on low-cost hydroelectric plants.

Backers said the resolution calls for advisory votes only, and the proposal is not binding on anyone. The resolution states that if communities show a preference for joining the Idaho Power system, the two utilities should begin negotiations.

House passes 3-cent increase in fuel taxes

BOISE (AP) — Motorists in Idaho might soon have to pay 3 cents more per gallon for gasoline and diesel fuel.

The Idaho House on Thursday voted 59-24 for legislation boosting the fuel tax, designed to generate nearly \$16 million per year.

Sponsor Rep. John Sessions, B-Driggs, called the extra money vital to Idaho's efforts at economic development and luring more tourists to the state.

"It is never pleasant to pass a tax increase," said Sessions. "But it is necessary to maintain our highways. This is a good way to raise the money."

The legislation is designed to put the fuel tax increase into effect April 1 or as soon as it is approved by the Senate and signed by the governor. The increase would boost the fuel tax from 17 cents per gallon to 20 cents per gallon.

There was only brief opposition raised against the increase. Some lawmakers argued it would hurt the state's truckers by making them less competitive. Other contented that it would come to the state with higher fuel costs in Idaho.

Co-sponsor Rep. Richard Adams, D-Grangeville, noted that there are

stretches of U.S. 95 in northern Idaho where big trucks are banned because the highway won't accommodate them. He said that factor alone costs the Port of Lewiston \$100,000 per year in lost revenue.

The bill originally called for about two-thirds of the increased revenue to go to the Department of Transportation, or \$9.8 million per year.

But Rep. Gary Robbins, R-Dietrich, led a successful effort to amend the legislation to send more money to local government. Robbins argued that when the tax increase was discussed earlier, cities, counties and highway districts agreed to support the increase with the understanding they would get half the increased revenue, not one-third.

Under the revised distribution formula, DOT gets an extra \$7.5 million per year, cities, counties and highway districts will share \$5.2 million and the cities will get \$2.2 million per year.

The legislation also produces an extra \$700,000 per year for the Department of Law Enforcement and \$200,000 more for the Department of Parks and Recreation, water recreation improvements and off-road vehicle facilities.

Dallas loses his 'good time'

BOISE (AP) — Recaptured game-warden killer Claude Dallas has been stripped of 365 days of good time, given 30 days detention and ordered to pay \$109 to repair the fences he cut through when he escaped from Idaho's main prison a year ago.

The penalties, imposed after an internal disciplinary hearing at the prison on Wednesday, are in addition to any sentence Dallas might receive for the actual escape. He faces up to five more years in prison on the escape charge. A hearing on that charge has been set for April 27.

The 365 days of good time taken away from Dallas represented the credit on his sentence he had earned for good behavior during the two years he was in prison before the escape.

Dallas, 37, a self-styled mountain man, was recaptured by federal agents in Riverside California two

weeks ago after eluding authorities for over 11 months.

He was serving a 30-year sentence for voluntary manslaughter in the January 1981 killings of Fish and Game Officers Conley Elms and Bill Pogue when he cut his way through two perimeter fences around the medium-security prison to escape on Easter Sunday night in 1986.

House gets message on higher education

Finally listening to a clear message from the people of the state, the Idaho House has responded this session with a large increase in appropriations for higher education which, if allocated well, will begin to lift Idaho's universities out of mediocrity. The infusion comes none too soon. In virtually every state in the nation, improvements in higher education are being put in place. Idaho has generally lagged these trends and has suffered for it as our best and brightest students have been lured out of state for challenge and opportunity.

A quality system of higher education is essential for Idaho. The alternative is for it to remain a natural-resource economic backwater of the nation, producing tons of potatoes and timber, but few scholars.

Much of the debate in the House this week on the higher-education-funding bill centered on how the state was losing ground. "We have to have a good educational system all the way through," said one supporter, Rep. Mack Neibaur, R-Paul.

Not everyone was swayed by the arguments. Rep. Jerry Callen, R-Jerome, again marked himself as an educational opponent in complaining that professors would get raises.

Rep. Celia Folkings, R-Buhl, also voted against the bill, saying it would mean higher taxes, some of which she said she could not support.

Well yes, raising money for higher education in Idaho will mean an increase in taxes. How else do we expect to pay for them?

The whole point of last year's upheaval in the Republican primary, in which a long list of right wingers were defeated, was that unless we make the economic investment, we're going to be an economic colony out here.

As one legislator put it this week, "We're in an economic war and we must make sacrifices." One wonders, looking at Folkings's vote on this issue, if she has gotten that message.

In the next few weeks, the Legislature will turn to taxation measures to pay for these investments, as well as others in such endeavors as the state Department of Commerce.

We have our own preferences as to where, and to what extent, those taxes should fall. But we do not doubt they are necessary. Investment in Idaho and in ourselves leaves few other choices.

Caring, awareness can help teen-agers

Every day we see another article, another full-page advertisement, another television interview urging us to accept contraception and abortion as the only answers to preventing the birth of babies to teen-age parents.

It's the technological solution to a problem that plagues us: too many teen-agers having babies. Pregnancy is a physical condition — therefore there must be a way to fix it. And the place to fix it is where the teen-agers are — in the school.

As a parent, I am not against the teaching of birth-control techniques to teen-agers. But I, and parents like me, reject contraception as the best, or only solution to the problem of teen pregnancy. To transform our schools into contraceptive dispensaries is to give a strong message that sex in adolescence is okay, that it is an approved extracurricular activity. "Do what you please but do be careful" is the message we would be sending.

I have worked with teen-agers for 35 years — in prisons, in schools and as a foster parent. I've had contact with them in many teen-age pregnancy programs. When young people have a real problem, such as pregnancy, alcohol or drug abuse, and you ask social workers or psychiatrists about it, the first thing they want to know is whether the teen-ager has received or given love, whether the teen-ager is part of a family or has any connections with the community and the social network. These are the underlying causes of most adolescent pathology, which no pills or devices can cure.

The basic mission of our schools is to develop character, motivation and love of learning in their students; to have a civilizing influence on them. The school is where the students are exposed to the greatest works, ideas and images of our civilization; where we teach our students to search for the right answer, not merely the easy answer.

Our society is obsessed with sex. It is part of every message our teen-agers receive. In their music, on television, in advertising, in the magazines they read, the role models they choose to emulate. But sex is thought of as just another appetite to be fed but not subject to inner controls?

Adolescent needs will be fulfilled only when we begin to understand that teen-age pregnancy concerns the whole person, the whole community and the society. It involves the individual at risk. It involves moral and ethical issues, not simply mechanical solutions. It requires, above all, communities that care.

Over the past seven years, more than 100 hospitals, clinics and health centers throughout America have transitioned themselves into just this kind of caring community. Instead of concentrating on the results of teen-age sex by handing out contraceptives and abortions, these "Communities of Caring" focus on the causes of much early sexual activity and pregnancy: low self-esteem, peer pressure, alienation from parents and emotions. It's an approach that has worked.

With teen-agers who have already had babies, the support and encouragement they receive in a Community of Caring program have reduced the rate of second pregnancies by more than 60 percent from the national average and have motivated 70 percent to 80 percent of the young women to return to school and become independent rather than to drop out and turn to welfare. As the Community of Caring approach has proved its value in changing the lives of pregnant

adolescents and their babies, it has become obvious that it could be equally successful as a program for non-pregnant teens.

Beginning with primary prevention models in a few cities, the Community of Caring approach is being requested by local school systems in such cities as New Haven, New York, Newark, Los Angeles, Cleveland, Kansas City and by entire states such as Utah and Texas.

These educators value most the Community of Caring's basic principle that learning cannot take place in a moral and ethical vacuum. As Dr. John Dow, superintendent of schools in New Haven, has said, "The Community of Caring's insistence on the values of responsibility, caring and sharing will be the salvation of the public schools of America. What will save our schools is a return to the traditions and the pride on which our schools were founded. Our young people need to feel loved and cared for, irrespective of the fact that we are public institutions. The Community of Caring lets us provide that love and support of the whole community, not just one or two teachers assigned the role of sex educators."

A high school English teacher had this to say about the program: "The Community of Caring has made a difference in the way I teach. Before, I talk about Hamlet's cruelty to Ophelia only in terms of the dynamics of the play. Now I'm more sensitive to the fact that sitting in my classroom are a dozen Ophelias, vulnerable to the emotional

manipulation of 50 Hamlets right in my school. So I take time to let them talk about relationships like this in their own lives."

Here are some other thoughts: From a coach: "I'd listen to the locker room talk and think, 'Well, guys will be guys.' Now I realize that this kind of talk is pressuring a lot of good kids to try to show they're grown-up men. And a lot of sex is happening just to prove a point."

A health educator: "Some people think clinics in schools are the answer. They're not. Most kids visit the clinic at most two to three times a year. What they need is our caring and our awareness every day, and that's what we try to give them."

A 16-year-old student: "If you aren't having sex or bragging about having sex, you're a wimp. Now I know someone is willing to listen, to help. I think that's going to take the macho pressure off a lot of guys like me."

Let us listen to parents, teachers and teen-agers themselves before the vastly increased commitment of resources called for by the advocates of contraception and abortion becomes national policy. There needs to be a recognition by public officials at all levels that there are effective approaches to adolescent pregnancy more in keeping with our traditions and values. Without these, we will only continue to pursue with cold illogic the fantasy of a magic bullet.

Demanding presidential contrition more ritual than reality

Demands that the president humiliate himself as a way of restoring his authority have become part of this country's ritual response to revelations of major error of misconduct in the presidential office. In his recent speech to the nation, President Reagan assumed "full responsibility" for his Iran policy and acknowledged making "mistakes." Yet these admissions, striking as they must have seemed to the rest of the world, stopped well short of the apology many in Washington were demanding. The apology issue, in fact, has been one of the main motifs in reporting on the president's speech and will probably be heard again Thursday night when he holds his first televised press conference since November.

Personal public contrition. Presidential politics in the mass-media age is as much ritual as reality. In responding to their respective crises of confidence, modern presidents, consciously or not, establish the precedents that will guide future conduct. Although publicly assuming responsibility for mistakes was not a practice of our early presidents, it has become a required part of the presidential pedigree. For example, President Kennedy, after the Bay of Pigs fiasco, admitted to being "the responsible officer of the government."

Even if a president should manage to save himself by this means, it will only give rise in the future to further demands. Not on this occasion, but on the next — for yet more solemn displays of public contrition and rhetorical self-flagellation.

Public humiliation of elected officials has been accepted practice in some other societies. Shakespeare shows us that the Roman people expected Coriolanus to "wear his humble weeds" by baring in public his scars of battle. His unwillingness to comply in full brought a fateful response from the demagogues, who awakened and aroused public opinion against this supposed insult.

Were the presidency not so personal an office — that is, were it not occupied by one man with whom the public senses a direct relation — no one would imagine demanding an apology for errors. We do not, after all, expect Congress to apologize when it rectifies a blunder of law or the Supreme Court to do so when it reverses itself on a point of constitutional principle.

GOP Senate majority split over budget

BOISE (AP) — With educators revealing in their House victory on state support for colleges, Senate Republicans found their majority almost evenly divided on the huge budget recommendation for public schools Thursday as leaders cast about for ways to close the gap between inadequate revenues and ambitious spending commitments.

The chamber quickly approved a series of noncontroversial budget measures, most involving agencies that do not rely heavily on limited general tax receipts, but stop short of a vote on the \$343-million public school allocation, moving behind closed doors in search of a consensus on the bill.

"We're so stinking far apart on it," Caucus Chairman Jerry Twigg, R-Blackfoot, said after the abbreviated 30-minute session. "About half of us think \$343 million is about right and half think it's too much. . . I think we could agree on how to spend it if we knew where we're going."

Senate sets vote today on revised tort reform

BOISE (AP) — Spurred by claims of overwhelming public support, the Senate Thursday set the stage for final action on a new legislative plan that Judiciary Committee Chairman Roger Fairchild called a compromise "between groups warring over the cause of Idaho's liability insurance crisis."

But while the Frutland Republican said the new tort reform package represented significant concessions by both sides, the Idaho Trial Lawyers Association maintained its opposition, arguing the bill's assault on the civil court system will not bring liability insurance premiums down or make coverage any more available.

The compromise bill was pushed through the committee early Thursday morning and Senate leaders juggled procedures to clear the way for final consideration. A vote scheduled late in the day was postponed until today to give lawmakers a chance to go through the 16-page bill.

Although its opposition continues, the Trial Lawyers Association, which has blamed the insurance industry, not the court system, for the liability crisis, conceded that the new proposal has a good chance of passing final legislative approval before the session adjourns.

The new bill, replacing one backed by the Idaho Liability Reform Coalition that the committee killed a week ago, generally retains the principles of the bill originally proposed by the coalition, the largest lobbying group ever put together in the state.

It retains a cap of \$400,000 on



now goes to Andrus for his signature. Although the bill raises additional money from the income tax, the bulk of the extra tax payments will come from higher-income individuals who have relied heavily in the past on deductions and shelters to keep tax liabilities down. State officials say the vast majority of Idaho tax payers will actually see their state tax bills drop under the conformance measure due to higher standard deductions and personal exemptions.

"I know it's a bitter pill for us to swallow," Sen. William Ringert, R-Boise, said of the tax hike. "But we need the revenue."

In addition, some lawmakers are looking at the tax break conformance measure is providing through increased personal exemptions as a source to tap in closing the revenue disparity in the 1988 budget.

Andrus on state aid to schools, GOP leaders were trying to generate a working majority to modify the ap-

propriation drafted by the budget committee to include at least several million dollars in one-time funding and possibly underwrite part of the total with revenue from the Water Pollution Control Fund.

Earmarking money in the school bill for nonrecurring expenses would reduce budget problems a year from now while raising the water fund again would ease the impact on general tax revenues.

But a number of lawmakers believed chances were good the school appropriation, \$300,000 higher than Andrus recommended, could win Senate endorsement without change just as the budget committee's \$101.7 million allotment for higher education did a day earlier in the House.

House supporters of that higher education budget, over \$2 million higher than the governor proposed, and some administration officials indicated the bill could also win approval in the Senate.

But if neither major education measure is trimmed back from its current demand on general tax receipts, Republican leaders could be stymied in their drive to reduce a now gaping \$21 million disparity between revenues and spending in 1988 to a more reasonable level that would preclude the need for a major tax increase.

Action has already been taken to trim the revenue gap by \$6 million, but a cut in higher education spending and a diversion of financing for schools to the water fund was needed to close the gap below \$12 million.

Aggravating the 1988 budget dilemma has been Andrus' notice to legislative leaders that they must deal with a looming \$4 million deficit in the current budget. Budget Director Martin Peterson said the red ink can be erased by legislatively approved budget cuts for the final three months of the current spending year or it can be pushed into the 1988 budget. That, however, would only worsen the already severe revenue problems in the new budget and enlarge the tax increase needed to solve them.

A number of tax measures have already been introduced in the House Revenue and Taxation Committee, including a new version of the investment tax credit repealer that Andrus had proposed as the cornerstone of his financing scheme but which was briskly rejected by Republicans.

The new bill, backed by some House Republicans and supported by the governor, would repeal the tax but allow companies with credits already earned to claim them over the next three years. Andrus' original proposal did not allow future claims of stockpiled credits.

Dog racing bill still alive

BOISE (AP) — Horse racers urged a legislative committee to kill a bill allowing pari-mutuel dog racing, saying the competition could seriously harm their industry.

But the House State Affairs Committee endorsed the legislation anyway on Thursday, with some members saying they thought anti-competition action by the Legislature was wrong.

"I'm caught between my friends from northern Idaho, and my friends and constituents from Canyon County," said Rep. Janet Hay, R-Nampa. She tried to get the committee to hold the bill indefinitely, which usually is a killing motion. But the panel voted 8-7 against holding the bill, and then sent it to the House floor for a vote with "do-pass" endorsement.

Demos endorse welfare reform

WASHINGTON (AP) — House Democratic leaders endorsed Thursday a sweeping welfare overhaul linking benefits to work, saying they hope to achieve this year the reform that has eluded Congress for decades.

"We are certainly aware that there have been many fruitless reform attempts in the past," House Speaker Jim Wright, D-Tex., said at a news conference announcing the plan.

But Wright said he is optimistic that this year will be different, because state demonstration programs have shown it is possible to move people from welfare to jobs and generally improve the system.

Wright said Democratic leaders of the four committees handling welfare reform have given their blessing to a proposal developed by Rep. Harold Ford, D-Tenn., chairman of the Ways and Means subcommittee on public assistance. He said a task force has been named to move the bill swiftly through committees and to the House floor.

Panel slashes defense budget

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Budget Committee voted Thursday to slash President Reagan's military spending request by more than \$23 billion, as Republicans sat by in protest of the panel's procedures.

The committee, by a vote of 13-8 with the entire GOP contingent voting "present" to take no position, tentatively approved \$228.7 billion in spending authority on defense programs in fiscal 1988. Actual cash outlays would be cut to about \$222.6 billion, compared with \$237.6 billion under the president's request.

The vote came on an amendment that actually raised military spending by \$3 billion over the approximate freeze at current levels the committee is using as its starting point for deliberation of the entire budget. The increase would not keep pace with inflation expected through the fiscal year, which begins Oct. 1.

Airlines work over schedules

WASHINGTON (AP) — Airline representatives combed over their schedules at Chicago and Atlanta in hopes of shuffling additional flights Thursday, to help ease the potential for delays this summer.

During the day another 50 flights were juggled at Hartsfield Atlanta International Airport, bringing the total number of flight changes at that airport to about 180, most of them in the morning and evening rush periods.

Meanwhile, American Airlines and United Airlines continued to negotiate privately on flight changes at Chicago's O'Hare International Airport. Industry and government officials said a summer schedule for O'Hare may be close to agreement.

AIDS tests sought for blood recipients

WASHINGTON — While emphasizing that "the risk of (AIDS) transmission by transfusion was low," federal health officials formally

recommended Thursday that physicians consider offering the AIDS antibody test to some patients who received blood transfusions between 1978 and 1985.

"This consideration should be based on the likelihood of infection in a recipient and the likelihood of transmission from that recipient," such as intravenous drug use or sex, the Centers for Disease Control said.

The risk of infection is greatest if the recipient received large numbers of transfusions, and if the blood was from who had already died — indicated collected during the few years before that 16 persons had become infected with the AIDS virus.

Meese backs drug test for beginning teachers

WASHINGTON (AP) — Attorney General Edwin Meese III said Thursday local school boards should be free to institute drug-testing programs for "probationary" teachers who seek tenure.

"We in the Department of Justice view freedom from drugs as a valid condition of employment for school teachers," he said.

"Drug testing has been upheld when applied to transportation workers and others whose jobs have a direct effect on public safety," Meese said. "And it seems to me almost an insult to teachers to maintain that their jobs are any less important."

His remarks were in a speech at the University of Mississippi, and copies were released in Washington.

"A railroad engineer who uses drugs directly endangers the lives of his passengers," said Meese. "But can one say that drug use by a teacher is any less dangerous, even though its effect may be less immediate?"

He added that "schools must furnish students with multiple examples of individuals leading drug-free lives, and who are glad to be doing so."

The heads of the nation's two largest unions of teachers spoke out strongly against Meese's remarks.

Shanker said Meese has "basically destroyed a couple of years worth of efforts on drug education and prevention efforts between teachers and schools by this kind of a stance."

Mary Futrell, president of the 1.8 million-member National Education Association, said that "knowing the attorney general, I'm not surprised by his position. But she said she was 'a little appalled' at the idea that all non-tenured teachers should have to submit to drug testing if a school board orders it. She said Meese had presented no evidence that drug abuse is widespread among teachers and that his remarks had not been "brought" into the debate over drug testing generally.

His comments came in connection with a court brief the Justice Department filed two weeks ago supporting a proposed teacher drug-testing program on Long Island. There, the Palischoe-Medford School District notified all probationary teachers who were eligible for tenure that they would be required to submit urine samples to their school nurses for drug testing.

The agency said that the decision to recommend the test for transfusion recipients grew from concern this past year after four long-term leukemia patients in New York City, an area with a high prevalence of infection and the largest number of AIDS cases in the country, developed symptoms of AIDS-Related Complex, an associated AIDS condition. All four tested positive for AIDS infection.

A subsequent study was conducted of other leukemia patients who had

received multiple transfusions and had no other risk factors for AIDS, such as intravenous drug use or sex, activity with an infected person. Blood tested from a total of 204 patients received large numbers of transfusions, and if the blood was from who had already died — indicated collected during the few years before that 16 persons had become infected with the AIDS virus.

The test indicates whether an individual has been exposed to the virus that causes AIDS, not whether he or she will contract the deadly disease. However, a person who tests positive is presumed to be infected and infectious to others.

Pollard probe may be doomed

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP) — The commission appointed to investigate the Pollard spy case may be doomed because a lawyer has advised three key witnesses not to testify and the investigators cannot force them to do so.

David Libal, the attorney, said Thursday he feared his clients' statements at the inquiry, which is being conducted in private, could be used against them in a U.S. court if the findings were turned over to the United States.

Jonathan Jay Pollard, a 32-year-old American Jew who worked as a civilian intelligence analyst for the U.S. Navy, was sentenced early this month in Washington to life in prison for selling U.S. military secrets to Israel.

Carter raps leadership lack

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — Former President Jimmy Carter said Thursday that peace efforts by America's friends in the Middle East are almost doomed to failure because of Washington's lack of leadership.

Accusing President Reagan of an inclination to use military force rather than diplomacy to solve problems, Carter said the president has shown little enthusiasm for trying to arrange peace talks in the troubled region.

"I would like to see... the peace process in this region pursued more vigorously," Carter told the American Chamber of Commerce in Egypt.

"I'm not here to criticize my own government, but I think it is accurate to say that most of the initiatives (to) take additional faltering steps toward productive discussions have had to originate in this region."

Exercises set up in Honduras

TEGUCIGALPA, Honduras (AP) — Joint exercises this spring will push American troop strength in Honduras to the highest level since the United States established a permanent military presence in 1983, sources said Thursday.

The U.S. and Honduran sources, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said more than 7,000 regular and reserve Air Force, Army and Navy personnel will take part in overlapping air, ground and amphibious maneuvers with Honduran forces during April and May.

"That would be about 2,000 more than were involved in the Big Pine II maneuvers of 1983, the largest joint exercise with this strategic Central American country to date."

Syrians threaten retaliation

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Syrian soldiers deployed in Moslem west Beirut have threatened severe retaliation if kidnappers kill any of the 25 foreigners held hostage in Lebanon, police said Thursday.

"The Syrians have sent messages through Shiite clergymen that they will not sit idly by if a foreign hostage is killed," a police official said, speaking on condition of anonymity. "They threatened the severest possible punishment."

He said one result of the Syrian threat was Tuesday's announcement by the Revolutionary Justice Organization that it had delayed killing French hostage Jean-Louis Normandin. The group said it put off his "execution" for a week.

In Christian east Beirut, a bomb killed two occupants of an automobile and wounded five other people, police reported.

U.S. ships deliver warning to Tehran

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Reagan administration, in a new warning to Iran not to escalate the Persian Gulf shipping war, has moved an aircraft carrier battle group into the northern Arabian Sea within striking distance of some new Iranian missile batteries, U.S. officials disclosed Thursday.

Moreover, U.S. Navy ships assigned to the Midwest Task Force to patrol the Gulf may soon begin escorting commercial tankers and cargo ships destined for Kuwait, the sources said.

Some of the warships attached to the carrier battle group also might be ordered to join the task force for such escort work, they added.

The officials, who agreed to discuss the matter only if not identified, said the United States now has 18 warships in or near the Persian Gulf following the arrival in the area of the Navy's Indian Ocean battle group, led by the carrier Kitty Hawk.

The Kitty Hawk and its battle group first arrived in the Arabian Sea more than a month ago. But several of the carrier's smaller escorts recently moved deeper into the Gulf of Oman, and plans to send the carrier to the Mediterranean Sea have been repeatedly delayed, the sources said.

While stressing no orders had been issued to prepare for a military operation, one source said the presence of the Kitty-Hawk and its warplanes was meant to convey a simple warning to Iran — "If they shoot at anybody with those missiles they can be eliminated."

The missiles referred to by the official are so-called HY-2 rockets, made by China and recently detected inside Iran. The land-based missiles are made for use against ships and have a range of up to 60 miles.

Although designed more than 20 years ago, the missiles are considered a potent addition to Iran's arsenal of weapons for use against commercial ships plying the Persian Gulf. Even more significantly to U.S. military planners, the missiles were detected in an area where they can menace the entire Strait of Hormuz, the sole passage way into the gulf.

"There is a new threat enveloping the strait," said one source. "We have to be prepared to respond to that threat."

Iran and Iraq, which have been at war for nearly seven years, have sought to cripple each other's oil and cargo trade by attacking commercial ships in the gulf.

Israel cuts arms sales

JERUSALEM (AP) — Heading off a confrontation with the United States, Israel announced Thursday it would not sign contracts for new weapons sales to South Africa and would reduce its close trade and cultural ties with the country.

The Israeli decision, announced by Foreign Minister Shimon Peres, followed pressure from the United States to end military trade with a South African government that maintains a policy of apartheid.

The sanctions left the Israeli government with room to maneuver in its 35-year-long relationship with South Africa by falling to end existing weapons contracts or to cut off all trade.

Israel does not discuss weapons sales, and it was not known how long existing contracts run or what kind of licensing arrangements Israel has with South Africa for the manufacture of Israeli-designed weapons.

A government panel was appointed to recommend further sanctions within two months and to specify which trade links would be curtailed, Peres said.

Israel has been reluctant to take action against South Africa because of the close business ties between the two countries and because of concern for the welfare of South Africa's Jewish community of 100,000.

Aquino may have been bomb target

BAGUIO CITY, Philippines (AP) — President Corazon Aquino may have been the intended victim of a bomb that killed four people and injured 36 at the Philippine Military Academy, the chief investigator said Thursday.

Mrs. Aquino is scheduled to deliver the commencement address at the academy on Sunday. The bomb exploded in the ceiling of the grandstand during a Wednesday rehearsal, causing part of the roof to collapse.

The communist New People's Army denied responsibility. NPA spokesman Tito de la Paz issued a statement saying that accusations pointing to his group are "a cover for the real culprits who apparently have easy access to the camp."

Meanwhile, the government's Philippines News Agency said 18 soldiers died in a major battle with insurgents Thursday in Misamis Occidental province of Mindanao island.

Former bank manager indicted for fund loss

BOISE — A former branch manager for Home Federal Savings & Loan Association in Twin Falls has been indicted by a federal grand jury on 15 counts of misapplying funds and six counts of making false statements.

Mary Kathleen Shank, of Filer, was scheduled to be arraigned this morning before U.S. Magistrate Miles Williams in Boise. If convicted, Shank faces a possible 15 years in prison and a \$505,000 fine.

A grand jury in Boise secretly in-

dicted her last Friday for incidents that allegedly occurred while she was a loan officer and later branch manager at the Twin Falls Home Federal office, from October 1984 to July 1986.

The indictment against Shank includes allegations that on 22 separate occasions she either "decreased teller cash" by a total of more than \$18,000 or improperly made deposits or withdrawals totaling \$24,000 in violating teller cash and the accounts of six different individuals. The largest of the transactions was for about \$5,000, according to the indictment.

Overall, "The loss appears to be in the \$25,000-\$30,000 range," Home Federal Senior Vice President Herman Voss said Thursday. Although the money came from its accounts, Home Federal was protected against loss because Shank and other officers are bonded. The responsibility for any lost funds would fall to the bonding agent.

The indictments announced Thursday were triggered when bank employees discovered funds missing during routine checks of the office's books, said Voss. A subsequent special audit of the Twin Falls branch turned up other instances.

The allegedly fraudulent transactions generally involved mortgage loan accounts, but some also came from savings accounts, he said.

"It was the sort of thing that it was inevitable that it would be discovered," the executive said. Shank was fired after Home Federal's internal investigation and the matter was turned over to the FBI.

Before the discovery, Shank had been a trusted employee. "I don't think there was any question of trust," Voss said. "She had worked for us for a number of years."

Shank had joined Home Federal at Nampa as a teller and, after leaving

the bank, rejoined the institution in the Twin Falls branch as a teller. She later was promoted to loan officer and assistant manager. Voss said he did not know the dates involved.

In November 1985 Shank became Twin Falls branch manager, which placed her in charge of all branch operations. She held that position for about a year.

"The majority of this took place while she was branch manager," said Voss, who also is chief lending officer.

The alleged embezzlement is the first such loss in least 39 years,

association officers said.

Home Federal has tightened oversight of its nine offices and placed accounts in the Twin Falls branch under special scrutiny to find any undiscovered losses.

The Twin Falls office conducts about 7 percent of Home Federal's mortgage lending, its main business. It held approximately \$9 million of the \$127 million in the system on Sept. 30. The Nampa-based institution has \$167 million in assets.

The Twin Falls is the easternmost branch in the network. Others are at: Mountain Home, Emmett, Boise and Nampa.

Murtaugh school levy election today

MURTAUGH — Murtaugh School District patrons will vote on the school district's \$125,000 supplemental override levy today.

Voters may cast their ballots from noon until 8 p.m. at two places, the Murtaugh City Hall and the Glenn Besire home on Foothill Road.

Registration to vote in this election is not required, but voters must be residents of the Murtaugh School District.

The decision to hold the levy election came as a result of input from area residents at a town meeting held in February. At the meeting Superintendent Frederick DiazGranados appealed to the district residents to support such a levy, saying the money would go to provide a "quality" education and to prevent the schools from losing accreditation.

The district was placed on the "advised" accreditation list after this year's annual review by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges.

DiazGranados said that being placed on the advised list was the first step down, and that, to lose accreditation would mean that graduates might have trouble getting universities or colleges to accept their credits. Or it could mean students would have difficulty transferring to another elementary or high school.

Additionally, he said state funding and membership in activity programs are threatened by the potential loss of accreditation.

Over the last several years, the district has been going deeper into debt. The deficit is now \$90,170. DiazGranados said that the district has been forced to obtain a tax anticipation loan in order to meet expenses.

Rising insurance and energy costs and a change in the way the state distributes funds has contributed to the district's financial problems.

A simple majority is required to pass the levy. If passed, it would add another \$5.50 per \$10,000 assessed property value on top of the current tax.

Rising fish count shows Rock Creek clean-up at work

TWIN FALLS — "Five-hundred-seventy-five grams, 41 centimeters," called out Bill Clark as the wild brown trout wiggled in a metal weighing dish.

The trout was big enough to widen the eyes of an angler. But the scientists gathered Monday at Rock Creek near the American fishing tackle factory, didn't have the tug of the fishing line or the smell of trout cooking in the frying pan in mind.

Clark, senior water analyst with the state Division of Environment, was helping colleagues who were electro-fishing. It's hardly a sport, because there isn't much chance to fly. The technique scoops up nearly all the fish in a typical 100-meter stretch where it's practiced.

The average angler isn't allowed to electro-fish, however. The state received a special Fish & Game Department permit to do it because it is trying to determine how well efforts to clean up Rock Creek are paying off. Between 1970 and 1974 Rock Creek was one of the most-polluted stream segments in the Pacific Northwest, said Ron "Big" Gilling, district conservator with the Soil Conservation Service.

The Rock Creek Rural Clean Water Program started in 1981 with \$2 million in federal funds to pay part of the cost of irrigation improvements and sediment-holding projects made by the 165 farmers who participate in the program. Sediment makes it difficult for fish to breed, breathe and find food, said Blake.

"The number of rainbow and brown trout has increased dramatically at this location since monitoring started in 1981. Figures on this week's count are not available yet, but Monday literally scores of fish netted were brushing in a half-dozen plastic buckets before being weighed."

In 1981 only two rainbows and no brown trout were caught near the sugar plant. By 1985 the average number collected jumped to 16 for rainbows and seven for browns. The average weight of the rainbows more than doubled during the period, according to a 1985 Rock Creek annual report.

"The fish live in the creek all the time. They are an excellent indicator of the water quality, a living monitor" of environmental conditions, said Clark.

The team of eight electro-fishermen from DOE and the Rock Creek program combed the bottom, at a crook in the creek where the water flowed swiftly. While two of their party held broom-length probes that fed positive and negative currents surging from a generator that whirred on the stream bank, the fishermen waded their nets in the water near the probes.

"Look for the white of their belly when they flip and then scoop 'em," one of the fishermen advised a novice.

There were whoops and yelps as big, shiny fish jumped around in the nets.

The fish mountain sculpin, rainbow and German brown trout, coarse-scale sunling on, are attracted by the positive probe current. "It attracts them and, when they are close, it stuns them," said Rich Morrison of

Market squeezes health-care industry

TWIN FALLS — Maintaining quality care at an affordable cost is one of the chief problems facing the health-care industry as it attempts to cope with dramatically changing market forces, hospital administrators told participants in a business leadership program Thursday.

A portrait was painted of hospitals being squeezed by these market forces into fighting for their very survival by the administrators of Magic Valley Regional Medical Center, Twin Falls Clinic and Hospital and St. Benedict's Family Medical Center.

Speaking to the monthly Magic Valley Leadership seminar sponsored by the Greater Twin Falls Area Chamber of Commerce and the College of Southern Idaho, MVRMC Administrator John Bingham cited increasing problems with health insurance coverage, government regulations, rising technology costs and vigorous competition as threatening the future of rural hospitals.

Robert D. Campbell Jr., administrator of St. Benedict's in Jerome, took the problem a step further.

Responding to a question from the audience as to how three hospitals can exist within 25 miles of one another in the Magic Valley, Campbell said the situation could lead to consolidation, or "it might mean someone going out of business. We're going to explore every option."

Further complicating the picture is a growing emphasis on healthier lifestyles, Campbell said, and its effect on hospital admissions — which have been declining in recent years.

Hospitals in largely rural areas such as the Magic Valley are beginning to face competition for patients not only from one another, Bingham said, but from what he described as "centers of excellence" in which new technologies are consolidated, such as the Humana Hospital in Louisville, Ky., which specializes in heart transplants. Some business firms are designating these facilities as treatment centers for certain ailments, he said, again putting smaller hospitals at a disadvantage.

The smaller hospitals must attempt to keep up with technological advances, such as the improved CAT-scan equipment installed last year at MVRMC at a cost of \$600,000, Bingham said, but those rising costs must be passed on to consumers; and consumers are faced with increasing difficulties in meeting those costs because of reduced governmental assistance and stiffer health insurance qualifications.

Health care will be the greatest force in shaping future systems, and government regulation/competition, Campbell said, pointing to several aspects of that consideration, including: "high-touch" relationships with patients; specialization; current technology; scope of services; future technology, which deals with currently difficult problems such as cancer and AIDS; access-payment systems; and government regulation/competition.

"Will small hospitals be able to deliver it?" Campbell asked of future technologies, noting that some 400 small hospitals are expected to close in the United States this year.

Hospitals are being transformed from "a cottage industry to a national industry," Campbell said, as large health-care firms such as the Hospital Corporation of America, which manages MVRMC, and Humana expand their networks. These linkages are needed to retain local business, he said, and the trend is expected to accelerate. "Some say there will be only five national systems," Campbell said.

Health department faces keeping own records

TWIN FALLS — The South-Central District Health Department on Wednesday wrestled with the prospect of keeping track of its own inspection records currently tabulated by the state Department of Health and Welfare.

"It's just interesting to me that the agency responsible for the information wouldn't want a copy of it," said Director Gerald Hurst of the inspection records. "They're going to trust us completely that we're doing our jobs."

The Health Department board Wednesday also discussed charging a fee for AIDS testing and approved a preliminary budget increasing its county funding support.

Hurst and SCDDHD environmental health specialist Alan Bierman said H&W apparently no longer cares to monitor how many inspectors do how much work

on how many establishments.

The Health Department currently reports to H&W's bureau of preventive medicine what each of its eight inspectors did every day, how long they spent at it, and what action was taken.

In return, H&W collates the information and provides SCDDHD monthly with a computer printout tabulating what took place, Bierman said.

But the Legislature cut H&W's ability to gather that information, Hurst and Bierman said, so that the Health Department will have to keep track of the information itself beginning July 1.

A new SCDDHD computer might cost \$1,600, but Hurst is more concerned about the expense of hiring people to input the information.

Bierman noted there are 1,000 restaurants in Magic Valley that could be inspected, and H&W will no longer know about their status. Restaurant inspection is one of 20 programs to be monitored, he said.

"They don't know how many establishments there are in Idaho or what we are doing to inspect them," Bierman said.

Hurst suggested that if SCDDHD has to buy a computer, it might charge H&W for the information gathered.

"If they want the information, they're going to have to pay for it," Hurst said.

A decision on how to best keep track of those records may be made at the district's next board meeting on May 20.

Free AIDS blood testing is feeling the bite of a limited Health Department budget. Because larger numbers of people are now being tested for AIDS, a board committee recommended that the Health Department begin charging a fee for the tests to cover the costs of counseling those tested.

Court: Minidoka not responsible for bills

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Supreme Court says Minidoka County is not responsible for medical bills submitted by the University of Utah Hospital for two indigent residents, because the hospital did not seek a hearing with the county after initial denials.

In separate unanimous rulings handed down Thursday, the high court agreed with 5th District Judge Ronald Bruce that the Salt Lake City hospital "failed to exhaust all administrative remedies available before the Minidoka County Commission."

The commission denied the hospital's request for payment of about \$38,800 for services rendered in the fall of 1963 to Jesus Villagomez, and for almost \$9,500 for services rendered in the fall of 1962 to Pamela Howard.

In each case the hospital filed no request for a hearing before the commission, but instead filed suit in District Court to recover the money. Bruce ruled in both cases, and the Supreme Court agreed, that the hospital should have pressed its case with the county before seeking relief in the courts.

In the absence of a hearing before the board of county commissioners, no record can be made, no findings of fact can be entered, and no record can be made upon which a district court can conduct its review under the statutes," Chief Justice Allan Shepard wrote in the Villagomez opinion.

The hospital was reported to have been broken to gain entry and the two generators were valued at \$700 and damage to the building was reported Thursday as \$150.

Previous studies have shown that the closer the fishermen get to the river, the fewer fish are found — because the agricultural runoff is greater.

But, overall, the Rock Creek program seems to be working. Sediment has been reduced 33 percent since the summer period of 1962, said Blake.

Comparing the health-care problems to similar ones being faced by the business community and schools in the Magic Valley, the Chamber's Executive Vice President "Buzz" Langdon said, "The only thing constant is change."

The result of reduced governmental financial aid to health-care consumers is the "rationing" of care, said Dr. Julian Nicholson, president of the Idaho Medical Association.

Speaking to the group after the panel of hospital administrators, Nicholson offered a physician's perspective on the problem.

"We send them (patients) home quicker and sicker," the Twin Falls surgeon said.

Restrictions on the amounts paid by insurance firms to hospitals on specific ailments because of the Diagnostic Related Groups concept often result in insufficient reimbursements, Nicholson said, forcing hospitals to make decisions on treatments that doctors rightly should.

Problems affecting the profitability of the health-care industry are also showing up in medical schools, Nicholson said, with many "bright young kids" choosing to go into business, rather than medicine.

From an economic standpoint, those students will be "financially better off," he said, "But if you're considering the priesthood, you might be able to do better (in medicine)."

Personal income, spending up sharply

WASHINGTON (AP) — Personal income rose last month and many consumers promptly went out and spent their new wealth, boosting personal consumption spending for February by 1.7 percent, the government reported Thursday.

The Commerce Department also said personal income rose by 0.9 percent in February, a sharp boost on a 0.2 percent increase in January.

After-tax income shot up even more, by 1.2 percent, following a 0.9 percent increase in January. Both of the February income figures marked their biggest rise since April 1986.

And the 1.7 percent increase in spending reversed a record decline of 2.0 percent in January.

Economic analysts called the growth encouraging, but analysts quickly added precautions, saying all is not as well as the numbers suggest.

The Commerce Department noted

that the increase in disposable income was due in part to taxpayer lags in filing W-4 forms under the new law. Many are having trouble with the new "withhold my paychecks" and the shortfall eventually will have to be made up.

The income figures also were helped by farm subsidy payments, which boosted farm income \$12.2 billion over January levels at an annual rate. Without subsidies, farmers would have shown a loss of \$300 million, the department said.

And the spending increase was calculated from a sharply depressed January level: February spending remained below December levels.

"It looks good, but it really isn't," said Michael K. Evans of Evans Economics Inc., of the report. "The gains in personal income are really not that spectacular."

Excluding the farm subsidies, he said, personal income growth was

modest. And personal spending averaged over the last three months — to account for the wide swings — only about 0.3 percent increase.

Wages and salaries jumped by an annual rate of \$15.6 billion in February, almost double the January increase of \$8.6 billion, the department reported. Farm incomes rebounded to increase by \$12.2 billion in February after falling at an annual rate of \$2.7 billion in January.

Personal consumption spending, which includes virtually everything except interest payments on debt, rose by \$4.9 billion at an annual rate in February after plummeting \$5.8 billion in January.

Purchased durable goods, items expected to last three or more years, rose by \$24.8 billion in February, a figure that largely reflects

the return of car buyers to auto showrooms. Durable goods purchases dropped by \$69.7 billion in January because so many consumers delayed their purchases to December.

The savings rate, which shows savings as a percentage of disposable income, fell to 3.6 percent from a 4.0 percent rate in January. But it was well above the record low of 1.3 percent in December.

The report pegged total personal income in February at an annual rate of \$35.8 trillion and personal consumption expenditures at \$2.86 trillion.



If one gets a chance to ruff with a worthless small trump, what's to think about? Look over today's results if you think it's a cut-and-dried case.

East's diamond eight forced South's king, and a trump was led to dummy's jack. A low spade was led from dummy to East's king and East returned the diamond queen. Should West ruff with his "worthless" small trump?

If he does, the defense is finished. South wins West's club shift, cashes his spade queen and drives out the ace of trumps. South ruffs a second club lead and crosses to dummy with the diamond ace. His last diamond goes on dummy's spade ace and the defenders get only three tricks.

It's a different matter if West refuses to ruff the second diamond. Dummy is forced to win the ace and no dummy's spade ace is isolated. There is no way to enjoy a diamond discard, and the defenders get two diamonds, one spade and one heart for one down.

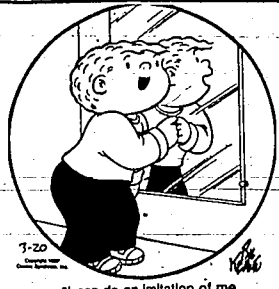

Hemingway tribute: BSU's literary complex

BOISE — Boise State University has established a literary and cultural complex bearing the name of Ernest Hemingway, who spent his final years in Idaho.

The Ernest Hemingway Western Studies Center, honoring "the most famous author ever to reside in Idaho," was dedicated last year on the Boise State campus. The ceremony culminated a year of special events at the school during which Hemingway's life and works were explored through symposiums and films based on his writings.

July 2, 1986, marked the 25th anniversary of the writer's death in Ketchikan, 150 miles east of here. "Ernest Hemingway found Idaho, after searching the world, to be a better place to live, a place to better face himself," said Boise State University President John H. Kester at the dedication. "What he wrote" was sometimes tough, even crude, but so was the West, and his work was as deep and as pure as a forest or a trout stream. This center is meant to encourage dreams, stimulate questions, perpetuate memories and the spirit of adventure.

What was once Boise State's red brick Music Building has undergone a major renovation and is now the Ernest Hemingway-Western Studies Center, housing all campus publishing activities.

The most recent book issued in the center's Ernest Hemingway Western Studies Series is the autobiography of Neil Shipman, a silent film writer, director, producer and star, who came to Idaho's Priest Lake in 1922. Her 1919 full-length

feature, "Back to God's Country," filmed in Canada and on California's Kern River, was a smash hit.

During her three years in Idaho, at Lionhead Lodge Studio on Priest Lake, she made another full-length feature, "The Grub Stake," and five two-reelers, "White Water," "Wolf's Brush," "Trail of the North Wind," "The Light on Lookout" and "The Love Tree."

Shipman's film career ended when she came along. However, she wrote the screenplay for "Wings in the Dark," starring Cary Grant and Myrna Loy, and later published several novels.

Valentine's Day was Neil Shipman Day on the Boise State University campus. Her son Barry Shipman, a screenwriter who lives in San Bernardino, Calif., has written an afterword to his mother's autobiography, "The Silent Screen Wildness might coexist, a place to live and living in Cabazon, Calif., when State University President John H. Lord of the Rings: The Aerobie eclipsing Frisbee on campuses

People have been throwing things ever since Cro-Magnon man discovered he was neither as strong nor as fast as his prehistoric neighbors. Somewhere along the way we discovered that throwing things wasn't only necessary for survival, it was also fun.

Today, most of our popular sports — baseball, football, basketball and a number of track and field events — involve things that fly, whether they are thrown or kicked.

Several of them involve throwing an object considerable distances. Consider: A professional quarterback can throw a football from end zone to end zone. The world's record javelin toss is nearly 550 feet. An outfielder can throw a baseball 400-500 feet.

Frank Aquilera topped all that on Feb. 4, 1984, when he threw a Frisbee a world's record 550 feet.

Impressive, maybe, but all those throws can regularly be beat by any average healthy teen-ager with an Aerobie, the 13-inch-diameter, 3.95-ounce flying ring that's adding new meaning to spring flings.

engineer and Stanford University lecturer Alan Adler, 48, the Aerobie is "last eclipsing the Frisbee as the missile of choice on college campuses, beaches and wide open spaces."

The Stanford University bookstore sold 5,800 Aerobies between March and December 1985, the first year they were on the market. Sales since then have taken off, says Adler, totalling 417,000 nationwide in 1985, 600,000-plus in 1986 and more than 1.75 million worldwide so far.

Scott Zimmerman, 24, who made his way into the Guinness Book of World Records in 1985 when he used an Aerobie to make the longest throw of any object in history — 1,046 feet, 11 inches — says: "Even beginners can throw it 50 to 60 yards."

Zimmerman's latest record-breaking throw was 1,257 feet. On April 17, the Washington, D.C., area native who he now lives near San Francisco will attempt to throw one or more Aerobies across the Polomae River.

Adler says slices now are being souped and that the distances involved likely will be in the 1,100-foot range.

Ballet in double time

Utah Ballet presents both classic, modern works at CSI

UTAH FALLS — Classic works and modern moves will stretch and reveal the talents of the Utah Ballet Thursday at the College of Southern Idaho Fine Arts Auditorium.

The performance will present two world-renowned works from the classical ballet repertoire, as well as two pieces choreographed by Conrad Ludlow, the company's artistic director.

The Utah Ballet is the company in residence at the University of Utah ballet department.

The program begins at 7:30 p.m. with "Pas de Quatre," set for the Utah Ballet by St. Anselm Dollin shortly before his death in 1983. The work was originally conceived by Jules Perrot in 1845 as a showcase for four of the world's most famous ballerinas of the time: Marie Taglioni, Carlotta Grisi, Luella Grann and Fanny Cerrito.

Perrot ended the ballerinas' jealous bickering about placement and height of solos by placing them in order of their age. A vital component of the choreography illustrates the jealousies among the four ballerinas.

Ludlow, a former principal dancer with the New York City Ballet, choreographed "Cecilia" and to the music of ragtime composer Scott Joplin, and "Grand Pas." "Grand Pas" was created for the Utah Ballet's portrayal of the New York City Ballet in the CBS miniseries "A Mother's Request," the story of Francis Schreuder's murder of a her millionaire father, Franklin Bradshaw, in Salt Lake City.

The pas de deux from the ballet "Don Quixote," staged by Li-Chou Cheng, ballroom dancer of the Utah Ballet, and William Beyer, principal dancer with Utah Ballet, will complete the program.

Beyer, a senior honors student at the U of U, has staged this pas de deux as his final senior project. The "Don Quixote" pas de deux is a work required for participation in international competitions.

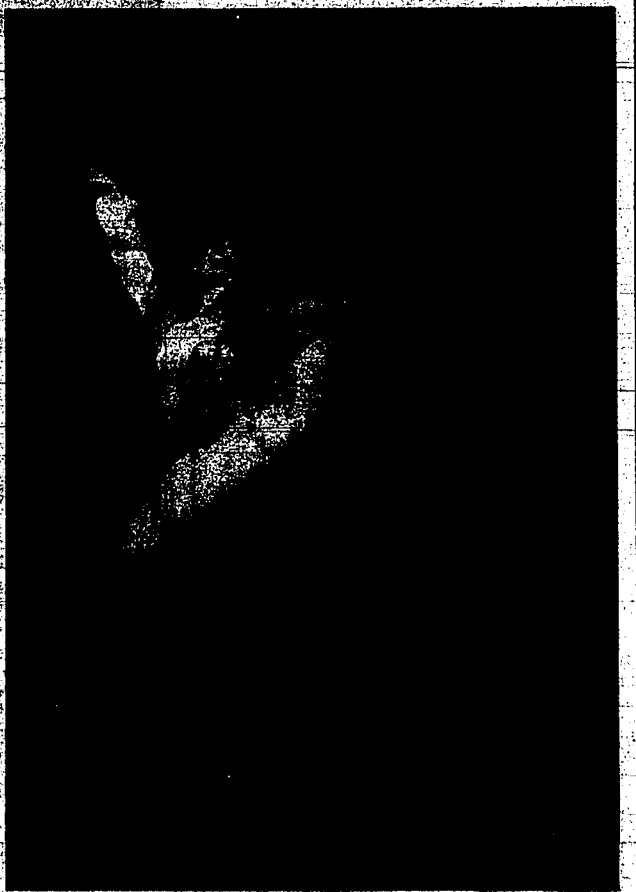

Pianist releases cassette

TWIN FALLS — A new music cassette has just been released in the Magic Valley, and although you may not recognize the recording label, many will recognize the artist. Kelly Brallsford Yost, who has been teaching piano to area residents for 25 years, has recorded her piano prowess for all to enjoy. The 60-minute tape, entitled "Piano Reflections," includes 21 classical piano solos.

The 60-minute, continuous play tape combines the works of classical composers Bach, Haydn, Chopin, Beethoven, Debussy, Satie and Saint-Saens with light mood selections such as Hardy's "Jennifer's Song."

The cassette cover is a photograph by Ketchum free-lance photographer David Stocklein of snow-peaked Mount Heyburn, reflected in one of the clear Bench lakes.

Until 18 months ago, Yost said she didn't even consider the possibility of undertaking such a project. "A friend of mine asked if I'd play at her father's funeral in July of 1985, and from there it just snowballed," she said.

Since Yost is a classical pianist, she said she did not have a repertoire of standard religious or funeral music to draw from. Instead, she chose to play several classical pieces, along with some lighter tunes.

After the funeral, two morticians approached to ask her to make a tape of what she had just played because it was "refreshing and different."

"I just had to have a copy of her music on tape," said Ronald Hamilton, owner of White Mortuary. "It was a far cry from the traditionally dreary organ pieces played at funerals. It was soothing, yet refreshing," he added.

After extensive marketing research, Yost found a niche open for an alternative to funeral music.

While recording the tape at Sun Valley Audio, recording engineer Lance Parker suggested to Yost to market the tape as general relaxation or meditation music.

For six months she traveled to the Ketchum studio, fine-tuning and

perfecting each piece for the final recording. "I had never done anything like it before," Yost said. Yost had the project well on its way, but still had not secured a record company to reproduce the tape.

"At first I decided to make the master tape, then search for a recording company that would reproduce it," Yost said. "But things fell into place much easier than I ever imagined."

Yost happened to mention the project to one of her piano students,

Nancy Strand, who revealed she was a former employee of Capitol Records.

Strand gave Capitol a call and they agreed not only to reproduce the tape and make it ready to sell, but to have one of their artists, Roy Kohara, design the cassette cover, Yost said.

She explained this was done for a fee and that the Capitol label will not appear on the cassette.

Yost is directly responsible for marketing the tape.

Yost graduated Phi Beta Kappa in music from the University of Idaho, and also attended graduate school in piano performance at the University of Southern California. She is a former Miss Twin Falls and currently is a member of the Magic Valley Symphony Orchestra.

Yost has given performances at area colleges and attends workshops throughout the country.

Burley jazz band snares honor

BURLEY — The Burley High School Jazz Ensemble placed third in its division at the 20th annual Lionel Hampton-Cherwon Jazz Festival held in Moscow, Idaho, on Feb. 28.

The ensemble was part of the "AA" division of bands, representing schools in the Northwest with enrollments of between 450 and 600 students. Ensemble director Skip Leone says that the 23-member Burley band competed with 21 other bands in its division.

A total of 220 different vocal and musical groups attended the festival, including 116 bands, he said. Groups from throughout the West participated in the competition, representing schools from Montana, Utah, Idaho, California, Oregon, Washington and British Columbia.

This was the Burley Jazz Ensemble's second time to compete in the Moscow event and the competition was tough, Leone said. Bands prepare for six songs, but only perform the three songs selected by a throw of the dice once the band gets on stage. Each group has only 20 minutes from the time the dice are thrown to perform the randomly chosen music as well as they can, he said.

The Burley Jazz Ensemble placed first in its division at the state musical competition held in Boise in early February. Leone compares musical competition to athletic

competitions, and says the state competition is like a state tournament while the Lionel Hampton competition is similar to regional trials.

The other two winning bands in the "AA" division were the Columbia High School of Troutdale, Ore., in first place; and Libby High School of Libby, Mont., in second place. Leone said that students from both these schools must audition to be selected for the jazz band as well as take private music lessons as a condition of membership. The Burley jazz band has neither of these requirements, he said.

'Lethal Weapon' holds the fort at box office

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "Lethal Weapon" continued to blow away the competition, taking in \$7.1 million more in ticket sales to keep its front in the box office race for the second straight week.

The film starring Mel Gibson and Danny Glover as a cop team pulled in \$16.9 million in its two weeks of distribution, searing off its closest box-office competitor, "Nightmare

on Elm Street III." The third go-round of the freighting trolleys of fendish Freddy Krueger took in \$5 million at the box office last weekend.

Placing third but holding strong was the venerable "Halloween" in its 13th week of distribution. The grim Vietnam war saga, fortified by nationwide critical acclaim, has amassed \$91.6 million.

Playing to more theaters offered a big boost to "Tin Men," a comedy starring Danny DeVito and Richard Dreyfuss, which placed fourth with \$10 million.

The voodoo thriller "Angel Heart," spurred by the controversy of its fight to avoid an X-rating because of a sex scene starring Lisa Bonet of "The Cosby Show," continued to draw audiences. It placed fifth with \$2.7 million.

John Hughes' latest teen drama, "Some Kind of Wonderful," brought in \$2.6 million in its third week to finish sixth, while the comedy "Mannequin" remained strong in seventh with \$2.5 million last weekend and \$24.3 million over five weeks.

compellers Zimmerman — is four-time world Frisbee champ) have switched or at least added Aerobics to their competitive field. One of them is Scotland, the East Coast champion Frisbee-catching border collie owned by Washingtonian Jendi Holmes.

"Scotland, McTavish and Magic, my other two border collies, all love the Aerobie," says Holmes. "After training after the Aerobics keeps the dogs in shape and keeps me running," Holmes, a bank teller, says she and the dogs practice their Aerobie skills a minimum half-hour every day.

Dogs and humans alike seem unanimous in their enthusiasm for the high-tech polycarbonate-and-rubber discs, the dogs possibly because the soft construction is easier on their mouths than the stiffer harder Frisbees, and the humans because they're just plain fun to watch and throw.

"All my life," says Adler, "I've been a fan of things that fly. There's a certain magic, a certain beauty, to airborne objects." It was that love of things aerodynamic, he says, that finally led him to the Aerobie.

"I looked at the things I had been doing most of my professional life," he explains. "I had been designing products (high-tech sensors and control devices) that I myself could neither afford nor use."

Adler decided to spend his non-working time researching and designing products "that were fun to use. For me, that boiled down to toys and sporting goods." He started with boats and moved on through boomerangs to the Skyro, an Aerobie predecessor that was considerably less stable and more difficult to fly. It did not, notes Adler, have the all-important stabilizing lip crucial to the Aerobie.

More than 100 prototypes — 50-plus discs and 50-plus rings — and several years later, Adler and his Aerobie. Previous experiences with licensing others to produce flying toys persuaded Adler to turn out the Aerobics himself. "They just couldn't handle the close tolerances the toys require," he explains, adding that the Aerobics are produced to tolerances of 1-2,000th of an inch.

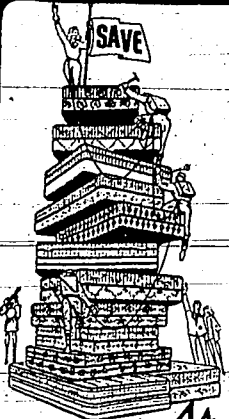
"I ended up going to a high-tech molding contractor in Silicon Valley, who normally made parts for computer manufacturers like Hewlett-Packard," he says. Sales, he declares, are skyrocketing to the extent that he's "become a full-time slave to my company." Superflight Inc.

Interest in the flying rings isn't limited to dogs and athletes. Adler recently was invited to give a 15-minute demonstration at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Ames Research Center in Mountain View, Calif.

"It's using a very basic aerodynamic theory," said one participant, aerospace engineer Mark Silva, "but it is very interesting to see a practical application."

"I was very well received there," says Adler, "as I was when I spoke before the Royal Aeronautical Society in London, and at MIT. There has been some discussion and testing of the Aerobie for military applications, but I can't say more than that," he says, referring to his presentation at the Lawrence Livermore (nuclear weapons) Laboratory.

Unclassified, public praise for the Aerobie, on the other hand, is flying in from around the nation. NASA aerodynamicist and swept-wing inventor Robert T. Jones declares that "the Aerobie is to the Pterodactyl as the Learjet is to the Piper Cub." "When a Frisbee dreams," says Peter Weybrauch of MIT, "it dreams it's an Aerobie."



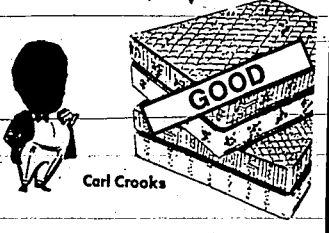

Utahn's murder gets 2nd TV look with 'Nutcracker' airing on NBC

By ANDREW J. EDELSTEIN

It's a story that's not so nice, but the networks had to play it twice.

No, you're not suffering from a case of *deja vu* viewing this week. The NBC miniseries *Nutcracker: Money, Madness and Murder* (airing 8 p.m. Sunday, Monday and Tuesday on K38AS and KUTV) recounts the same story viewers saw in January's CBS miniseries "At Mother's Request" — the sordid tale of Frances Schreuder, a wealthy socialite who ordered her 17-year-old son to kill her father, a prominent Utah millionaire.

Let history note that this marks the first time that two miniseries have covered the same event in the same season. (In previous seasons, there have been competing TV movies about the Israeli raid on Entebbe and about Prince Charles and Princess Diana.)

Here's all you need to know about the differences: "Nutcracker" is based on Shama Alexander's book "Nutcracker: Money, Madness and Murder" (NBC added the word "and" to the title), while the CBS production was based on Jonathan Coleman's book "At Mother's Request." An older actress, Lee Remick, 51, plays Frances Schreuder in "Nutcracker;" the role was taken

in "At Mother's Request" by 44-year-old Stefanie Powers.

"Nutcracker" contains 139 costume changes; "Request" only 44. "Request" was shot on location in Salt Lake City, while "Nutcracker" used Los Angeles to substitute for the Utah city. Ironically, both productions were also shooting at the same time in New York City.

The biggest difference, however, is that "Nutcracker," with its extra two hours, delves into Schreuder's background, while "At Mother's Re-

quest" essentially stayed in the 1970s.

NBC actually bought the project first, but CBS was first out of the gate with its version. The four-hour miniseries placed in the top 20 Nielsen ratings, helping CBS win the week.

Whether viewers will want to watch the same story — with added flourishes — remains to be seen. The presence of Remick, a fine actor, and a supporting cast that includes G.D. Spradlin, John Glover and Linda Kelsey, may help.

But one thing is sure: The story has the same ending. If you were otherwise occupied during the first week of January or haven't read the books, both Frances Schreuder and her son, Marc, were convicted in 1983. Frances, is serving life imprisonment for first-degree murder, while Marc is serving five years to life for second-degree murder.

ATLANTA (AP) — Time Inc. confirmed Monday that it is negotiating to join the investment group that is buying a 35 percent stake in Turner Broadcasting System Inc. for \$550 million.




Time officials would not elaborate, and TBS would not comment.

A group of 14 cable operators headed by Denver-based Tele-Communications Inc. and California financier Kirk Kerkorian entered a preliminary agreement in January to buy part of Turner.

Negotiations with other cable companies have continued, and three other cable operators have since joined the group. Time owns American Television & Communications Corp. and had negotiated with the group previously.

TBS plans to use proceeds from the sale to repurchase 53 million shares of preferred stock issued last year.

image as a quiet type.

Q. I heard they're making a movie about President Reagan's "Star Wars" policy. How? — G.E.

A. Sounds as though you may have been getting crossed signals. What you're probably referring to is Mel Brooks' new "Spaceballs" epic, set for release in June, which features such comedy stalwarts as Dick Van Patten, John Candy, Rick Moranis — and Bill Pullman as a sort of outer-space Indiana Jones-type who rides around in an interstellar Winnebago. "Spaceballs" is the ultimate parody of sci-fi flicks and had a budget of \$22,700,000 — which led Hollywood jokesters to say it was almost as much as the budget for the real Star Wars.

Q. We loved the movie "42 Charing Cross Road," with Anne Bancroft, the true story of an American writer and her 20-year correspondence and subsequent friendship — via mail — with an English bookstore's employees. Does anything remain of the wonderfully atmospheric London bookstore that figures in this film? — J.V.

A. Marks & Co. was a very real place but just as in the movie, it closed its doors forever in 1969. Geoffrey Heitman, the film's producer, said that re-creating the bookstore was difficult, because Charing Cross Junction is in the heart of the theater district at Canterbury Circus and is now the site of a record shop and compact disc center. Ultimately, Marks & Co. was reconstructed, indoors and out, on a sound stage at Shepperton Studios; replete with old prints, period signs, papers and no less than 12,000 volumes lining the shelves, lending it character and authenticity.

Q. In some TV notes written by a movie expert, he claimed that Hedy Lamarr's accent in the famed movie "Algiers" is Czech, and further so is her background. Is this accurate? — W.C.

A. Movie maven or not, that fellow's geographically off base. Hedy Lamarr, born Hedwig Klesler in Vienna in 1913, possesses to this day a lilting Viennese accent. Perhaps that fellow's confusion stems from the fact that Lamarr's first movie, the notorious "Ecstasy," was a Czechoslovakian production.

Q. A photo caption in a major New York newspaper concerning the forthcoming 50th anniversary of "Gone With the Wind" claims that the only surviving cast members of that

movie epic are Olivia de Havilland and Butterfly McQueen. Out of that huge cast, can this possibly be accurate? — B.R.

A. All I can say is that report would be news to Evelyn Keyes, who portrayed Suelien, Scarlett O'Hara's younger sister (Keyes even wrote an autobiography using that very title), as it would be to Fred Crane, who was cast as Brent Tarleton, one of Scarlett's suitors in the opening sequence at Tara. Each performer is very much alive.

Q. Is Irving Wallace's new book coming out about people's sex lives a work of fact or fiction? — P.K.

A. Wallace's new one, "The Celestial Bed" (Delacorte), is a controversial sizzler about the lives and loves of a sex therapist and his five sex surrogates — and it is fiction. Oddly enough, 15 years ago Wallace penned a nonfiction best-seller, "The

Carson nets multiyear pact

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Johnny Carson, whose "Tonight Show" has dominated late-night television for 25 years, has signed a new multiyear contract with NBC, the network said March 13.

The network would not reveal details of the contract, but it ends speculation that Carson will step down when the current contract expires in September. Carson, 61, celebrates his 25th anniversary as host of "The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson" on Oct. 1.

Carson's annual income is reputed to be about \$18 million, according to divorce papers filed last year by his third wife, Joanna Carson.

In announcing Carson's new contract, NBC Entertainment President Brandon Tartikoff said, "All of

us at NBC are thrilled that the man who has defined late-night television for the past 25 years has chosen to continue as the host for "The Tonight Show." Johnny Carson is the best there is and remains the cornerstone of the NBC network."

In a statement released by NBC, Carson said, "I'm especially grateful to Brandon for continuing my long-term relationship with NBC, as I have no other marketable skills in today's job market."

Carson's ratings have remained high — an average 7.1 and 12 share this year — despite the stiffest late-night competition since all three networks fielded talk shows more than a dozen years ago.

His rivals include Joan Rivers and David Brenner.

Midyear replacement in top 20; NBC wins another ratings week

NEW YORK — NBC added another series to the top 20, "Rags to Riches," and racked up its 22nd weekly win of the season last week, topping its previous high, according to Nielsen ratings released Tuesday.

"It's the most (weekly wins) we've ever had, period," said Gerald Jaffe, NBC vice president for research projects. "And it's almost the most since ABC had 25 (weekly wins) in '78-'79."

CBS holds the record for its sweep of the 29-week season in 1963-1964. ABC won 27 weeks out of 32 in the 1976-1977 season. NBC won 24 weeks of the season last year.

NBC won the week with an average, prime-time rating of 18.2 and a 28 share. CBS had 15.1 and 24 share. ABC had a rating of 13.4 and a 21 share. NBC's average-prime-time rating so far this season is 18.0, CBS' is 16.1 and ABC's 14.2.

The rating is a percentage of the estimated 87.4 million households with televisions. The share is a percentage of the available viewing audience.

"The Cosby Show" was No. 1 with

a rating of 36.6 and a 54 share.

The rest of the top 10 were: "Family Ties," "Cheers," "Rags to Riches," "Murder, She Wrote," "Golden Girls," "60 Minutes," "Growing Pains," "Who's the Boss?" and "Matlock."

"Cheers," "Who's the Boss?" and "Matlock" were reruns.

Reruns didn't deter some viewers of popular series last week. A "Moonlighting" repeat on ABC was 11th. NBC's "L.A. Law" landed in 17th place. Repeats of "227" on NBC and "Perfect Strangers" on ABC were tied for 22nd.

The bottom 10 shows out of 72 were, from the bottom: "Our World," NBC News special "Nuclear Power — It Works in France," "Spies," "Wizard," "Starman," "Amazing Stories" special, "Amazing Stories," "Spenser: For Hire," "Simon & Simon," "The Beach Boys — 25 Years Together" and "Colby." "Family Ties" was a highly touted one-hour episode that aired without commercials for the last half hour.

The two-hour premiere of "Rags to Riches" on March 9 was in the top 10. NBC's highest-rated movie this season with a 25.3 and 36 share. The series was in its regular time period Sunday and ranked 18th with a rating of 17.3.

CBS was pleased with "Houston Knights," which debuted in a special two-hour episode on March 11 with a 17.1 rating and landed in 19th place.

CBS' other recent tryout, "Spies," remained at the bottom of the ratings. ABC's new sitcom "Harry" was 35th.

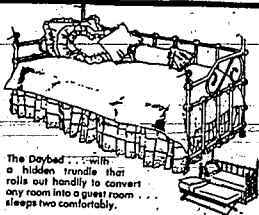

Rivera rolls with the punches

DENVER — Geraldo Rivera is exhausted. He was out filming teenage boy and girl prostitutes being hustled by people he calls respected members of the Denver community until 3:30 a.m. Friday. Denver's problem is typical, he says; there are 200,000 adolescent prostitutes in the United States, median age 15.

Teen pregnancy, suicide, prostitution and drug abuse will be covered in his next special, "Innocence Lost: The Erosion of American Childhood," to air April 20. So far, 164 stations around the United States have agreed to carry the special despite the overwhelmingly negative reviews for his previous effort, "American Vice."

Rivera was also here to work on his talk show, "Geraldo Live," to debut Sept. 6. The weekday one-hour show produced by Tribune Broadcasting has been picked up by 16 of the top 20 markets. Rivera promises to be unlike Oprah or Phil.

"There's room for a passionate people reporter. Hip sounds too pretentious, but it will be more modern" than Winfrey's or Donahue's show, he says. For starters, it will be mobile. "We're going to bust out the walls of the studio. It won't be limited to the others too often are; to bedroom issues. I won't do every possible angle of the Chippendale dancers

story," he said.

Even while chatting on daytime TV five times a week, he plans to produce a prime-time special every four months. He will return to the subject of drugs often, he says, "Because I am an expert, I've covered dope since the beginning of my career in television."

Nobody ever accused Rivera of being self-deprecating.

The practitioner of first-person, high-profile journalism has taken his knocks for letting his self-promotion get in the way of his stories. Al Capone's vault still haunts him.

"The reaction was vast but benign. The viewing audience didn't blame me for the bad news," he said. When the "infotainment" special turned up an empty vault, the result was "mostly me as the brunt of jokes" on TV, in cartoons and in newspaper columns.

The man is irrepresible. While noting that the Al Capone special beat "The Cosby Show" in the ratings and "American Vice" had an audience "equal to '20-20' plus 'Our World' that week," he knows that his name has become a punch line.

"The ironic thing is my one year as an independent has pushed me into the pop culture as part of the landscape."

What bothers him, he says, is that the \$30 million lawsuit against him filed by a woman filmed in "American Vice" was reported on page one of most newspapers.

Walters blasted

HOLLYWOOD - While ABC news executives downplayed the ethics of Barbara Walters secretly acting as a White House courier for Manucher Ghorbanifar, America's most respected journalism pundits were fuming over the incident Tuesday.

From Harvard to Stanford, Walters was uniformly condemned, even though her own network announced that she would not be disciplined for acting as an off-camera go-between for the Iranian arms dealer.

"I think her conduct was outrageous and unethical if the facts are, as we understand them to be now," said James Risser, director of the James S. Knight professional journalism fellowship program at Stanford University and former Washington bureau chief of the Des Moines Register.

"Journalists ought to, as much as they can, stay out of the scene they are reporting on," said Ben Bagdikian, dean of the journalism school at the University of California, Berkeley, and former executive budgetman for the Washington Post.

Walters was not available for comment Tuesday.

 CBS cut away from the final seconds of the second-round game Sunday at 5 p.m. MST so it's prime-time schedule would not be delayed, network spokesman Mark Carlson said.
 "We were in a must-get-off-the-air situation," he said. "We had a 15-minute program coming on (after Minutes) and 'Murder, She Wrote' at 9, and delaying that would have created a major problem."
 CBS often delays the start of Minutes when an NFL game is late during the football season. Carlson said that couldn't be done with the People's Choice Awards because it wasn't a network-produced show.

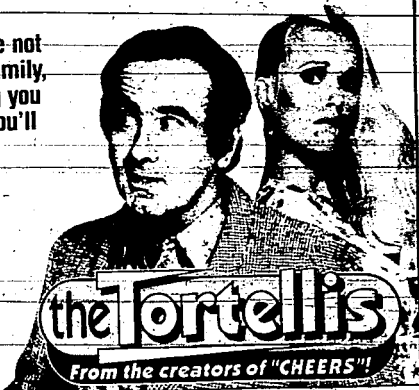

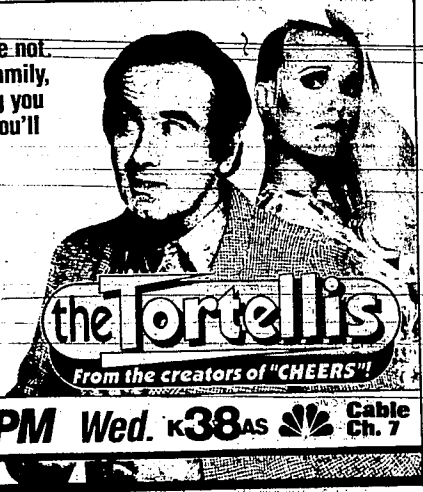

WASHINGTON—“Did you hear what Big Mo said today?” Sam Donaldson asked his party guests March 9. “Big Mo said that Col. North and Adm. Poindexter should be court-martialed for treason! And she said that the president is ‘royally P.O.’d, and I cleaned it up for you guys in the press!”

Having thus dispensed with the exploits of Margaret Reagan, ABC’s White House correspondent was ready to celebrate the publication by Random House of “Hold On, Mr. President!,” his memoirs, with a first printing of 65,000.

Donaldson himself was full of opinions — such as on President Reagan’s latest statement on the Iran-contra scandal.

“The man said, ‘I didn’t know what I was doing but then the Tower Commission told me,’” he scoffed. “I don’t believe that! He knew exactly what he was doing!”

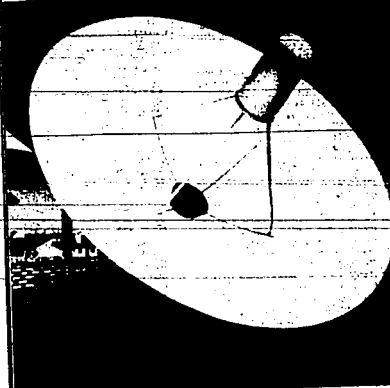
Then Donaldson grew contemplative. “I think he’s fundamentally changed! He’s lost hiselan! His feeling about life!”

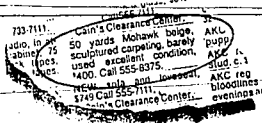
