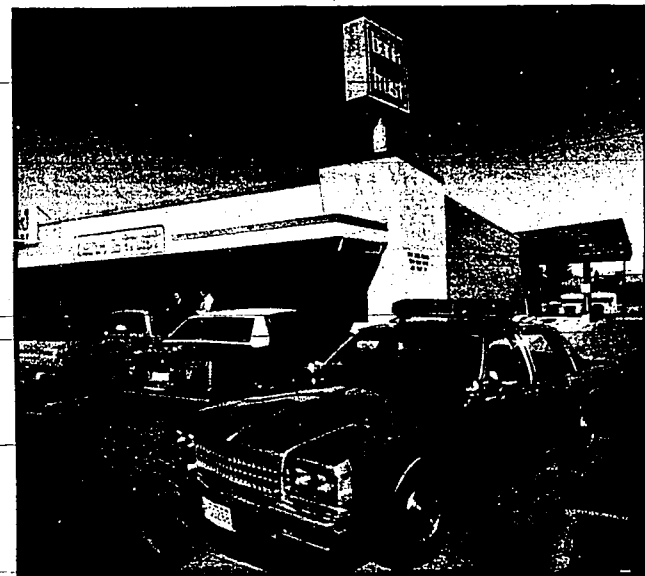

## Judge throws out lottery initiative

BOISE — A district judge has ruled that the state lottery initiative approved by 60 percent of the voters is unconstitutional and void.  
Fourth District Judge Gerald Schroeder said in a ruling handed down Thursday that a constitutional prohibition applies to establishment of a lottery, whether it is done by the Legislature or by initiative.  
Schroeder predicted his opinion would be upheld by the Idaho Supreme Court.  
"Forecasting the future is generally a gamble," Schroeder said. "However, in the context of this case there appears to be a better chance of predicting the fate of this initiative in the Supreme Court than there is of drawing the winning number in a lottery."  
Schroeder said the thrust of a 1953 Idaho Supreme Court decision was that "lotteries are unconstitutional, not merely that the legislature cannot authorize them."  
He ruled on two lawsuits challenging the lottery initiative, one filed by the groups Help Idaho Thrive and Idaho Allied Christian Forces, and another by Associated Taxpayers of Idaho.  
Backers of the initiative, including Senate President Pro Tem James Risch, contended that the Idaho Constitution prohibited the Legislature from authorizing a lottery without properly amending the constitution, but did not preclude establishing a lottery by initiative.  
Critics contended the initiative attempted to sidestep the process for amending the state's constitution, which requires a two-thirds majority in the House and Senate before a proposed amendment can be put to the voters.  
But Schroeder said, "There are logical arguments and weighty authority supporting the plaintiffs' view that the restriction... extends to all legislative power, whether it is exercised by the legislature or by the people directly."  
When the state adopted the constitution, there was no initiative process and legislative power was all that existed, Schroeder said. "Therefore, it appears the purpose of (the article banning lotteries) was to prohibit the authorization of a lottery within the state."  
The initiative amendment was drafted in 1911.  
Schroeder said it appears likely that those legislative restrictions that existed in the constitution were assumed to be applicable to this new legislative process.  
Schroeder said the Idaho Supreme Court would likely uphold the lottery ruling, even though it upheld the constitutionality of placing the initiative on the November ballot.

## Reduce population of prison by 100, court orders state

BOISE — A "federal-judge" has given the state Board of Corrections until June 30 to reduce by at least 100 the number of prisoners housed at the Idaho State Prison south of Boise.  
In a ruling released Thursday, U.S. District Judge Harold Ryan said he prohibited prison officials from placing more than two inmates in any cell for even a limited period. He said "it is constitutionally prohibited... for inmates to be housed at any time in day rooms or other non-designated cell areas or to be forced to sleep on mattresses on the floor."  
On Thursday, 748 inmates were housed in the main prison. The ruling did not address Idaho prison facilities in other parts of the state.  
Ryan gave the board until June 30 to comply with the order, saying that the defendants need sufficient time to take the necessary steps to meet his requirements. Board of Corrections Chairman Robert Anderson said the prison population likely would increase by then.  
The ruling did not levy any fines against the board. Anderson said officials had been braced for the possibility of fines, and said it was welcome news that none was included in the ruling.  
Gov. Cecil Andrus said the state "will move immediately to carry out the order. I have asked my legal counsel to examine the order in detail and have requested the director of the Department of Corrections to prepare a plan and brief me as to how we will accomplish what Judge Ryan has told us we must do."  
Anderson predicted the order could be met without any large-scale early paroling of inmates. After a report by prison specialist W. Raymond Nelson was issued in February, Anderson said, the board in-structed Corrections Director Al Murphy to start looking at ways to trim the prison population.  
Murphy was touring the prison's facility in Orofino Thursday, and could not be reached for comment. Anderson said one possibility for paring the prison population was housing prison inmates in county jails, though he conceded that many of Idaho's county jails also are facing overcrowding problems.  
Kootenai County is completing a new jail, which could provide space for several inmates who might serve as cooks, Anderson said. "If we can place two or three here, three or four there, it makes the numbers work," he said.  
Kootenai lawmakers have appropriated \$8 million for a \$20 million new maximum security prison next to the existing prison south of Boise, and have authorized the Division of Public Works to seek private or gov-

## Roadblock bags suspect after holdup

TWIN FALLS — An alert Idaho State Police officer helped apprehend a man suspected of robbing the Lynwood branch of Twin Falls Bank and Trust Thursday morning, less than an hour after the robbery at a roadblock north of the city.  
Twin Falls Public Safety Director Tim Qualls said Troy Allen Gascon, 26, who gave his address as Prineville, Ore., was arrested at a roadblock at the south end of the Perrine Bridge on U.S. Highway 93.  
Police received a report at 10:49 a.m. from the bank, saying a teller had just been robbed by a man who said he was carrying a bomb in a box.  
Qualls said the robber entered the bank and went to one of the five teller cages. He placed a box on the ledge in front of teller and handed her a note saying there was a bomb in the box and, if she would cooperate, "nobody will get hurt." The note also told the teller to give him all of the money, Qualls said.  
Qualls and bank officials were not releasing the amount of money taken. Court records identified the teller as Lisa Runyan.  
"She (Runyan) acted properly under the circumstances," Qualls said. "She didn't offer any resistance or make any wrong moves. Nobody was hurt."  
The robber did not wear a mask, but the description given to police did not closely match Gascon. When stopped at the roadblock, Gascon was wearing a different jacket than that described by bank employees. He was also somewhat taller and had a mustache

although Runyan remembered him as being clean-shaven.  
Had-it-not-been-for-an-alert Idaho State Police officer near the roadblock, Gascon might have been waved through by other officers.  
State Police Cpl. LaMont Johnston said he was parked

## House vote tosses away key to solving budget problems

BOISE — A tax-increase-bill touted as the possible key to solving the state's budget problems this session was defeated in the Idaho House early Thursday evening.  
Leaders of both parties immediately started negotiating a compromise. Rep. Jack Kennevik, R-Boise, majority floor leader, said it was still possible the session could adjourn by this weekend.  
But for that to happen, Kennevik said, the House would have to agree on a new bill raising about \$16 million in additional revenue, and send it to the Senate today.  
A proposal called a compromise by the GOP leadership came up for a vote in the House, designed to raise both corporate and individual state income taxes. But all 20 House Democrats voted against it, claiming it placed too much of the tax increase on low-income individuals and not enough on corporations.  
Despite the fact it was a leadership bill, the GOP couldn't even muster a majority for the measure, with just 31 votes from the 64-member Republican caucus. Rep. Mack Neibaur, R-Paul, was absent.  
The measure barely made it to the floor for a vote.  
On a 10-8 vote, the Revenue and Taxation Committee endorsed it. Higher individual and corporate income taxes, together with a speedup in the collection of corporate taxes, would generate more than \$16 million per year in additional revenue — the amount needed to balance a state budget that includes hefty funding increases for public schools and higher education.  
Republican leaders countered that if Democrats help defeat the latest tax proposal, it might be necessary to put the education budgets up for amendment to start taking money out. That threat was made by several Republicans in debate for the bill.  
The four Democrats on Revenue and Taxation Committee voted against printing and introducing the new tax bill. Despite the fact the measure was pushed by the GOP leadership, Republicans Stan Erskine, Phil. Childers, Eugene Stucki and Mike Simpson voted against it.  
Kennevik said negotiations on a compromise with the Democrats would not be limited to any specific proposal. He said there was talk that repeal of the investment tax credit, which has been consistently rejected by the GOP this session, might be revived.

## Chiles presents deficit-cutting plan

WASHINGTON — The chairman of the Senate Budget Committee on Thursday proposed a \$1 trillion spending plan with up to \$18.5 billion in tax hikes, and House budget writers wrapped up a similar package as Democrats tried to outdo President Reagan's deficit-cutting efforts.  
The proposals would miss the Gramm-Rudman law's goal of reducing the deficit to \$108 billion in fiscal 1988, based on Congress' own estimates. However, the Democrats in both chambers said less-stringent White House estimating would show they hit the target — as Reagan claimed he had.  
Chairman Lawton Chiles, D-Fla., offered the Senate Budget Committee a spending plan that would cut deficits \$37 billion next year, \$1 billion more than Reagan's budget proposed.  
"The president is chiding Congress for not producing a budget," Chiles said. "Well, we've got one that is better than his."  
House Budget Committee chairman William H. Gray III, D-Pa., declined to release his plan until next week but he also claimed more deficit reduction than the administration's budget.  
Chiles' proposal did not specify what taxes would be raised, but the senator said the committee would not raise income tax rates. Increased levies on energy, cigarettes and tobacco would be discussed, he said.  
A plan allowing early repayment to the government of rural electric

## Church says it may dismiss Bakker for 'moral failure'

FORT MILL, S.C. — The PTL's new leaders said Thursday that Jim Bakker and his wife would stay on the payroll but must not be active in the ministry, while Bakker's church said it might face dismissal for "moral failure" in a sexual liaison seven years ago.  
"The body of Christ is too valuable to be a party to bickering and conflict," the Rev. Jerry Falwell said after the new PTL board held its first meeting in an attempt to restore harmony after the tumultuous disclosures of recent days. "We are determined that Satan will not have a field day."  
Falwell said the board had agreed to an independent audit of PTL's finances and also would consider taking out a \$50 million loan from an unidentified source in Great Britain to consolidate its debts.  
Meanwhile, the woman with whom Bakker had the encounter told reporters she was "deeply concerned" that churchgoers everywhere should understand the current scandal "has no reflection upon the Lord." "I don't want people under the impression this goes on everywhere. It does not go on everywhere," Jessica Hahn said outside her West Babylon, N.Y., home.  
Earlier Thursday, newspaper reported that PTL lawyers had agreed two years ago to pay Ms. Hahn and her representatives \$265,000, far more than the \$115,000 initially reported.  
Bakker resigned as head of the television ministry last week, saying he had been blackmailed over the liaison and that there was a "diabolical plot" to take over the 500,000-member PTL.  
"We do not believe there is any evidence of blackmail," the Rev. G. Raymond Carlson, general superintendent of the Assemblies of God, said in a statement at a news conference at church headquarters in Springfield, Mo.  
"To the contrary, the evidence seems to indicate that effort and money have been expended to cover moral failure. We are deeply sorry to have to say this. We grieve for the impact all this has had upon the entire Christian community."  
Carlson said evidence gathered by the Assemblies of God will be sent to the North Carolina state attorney general for jurisdiction over the South Carolina-based PTL.

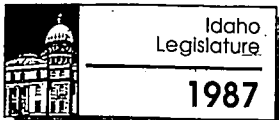


# 21-year drinking age passes 2nd time



BOISE (AP) — Hoping its second effort pays off, the Idaho Senate on Thursday again approved legislation raising the legal drinking age from 19 to 21 to end a long-running battle with the federal government over state sovereignty.

Over renewed protests against federal blackmail and coercion, the bill was sent to Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus on a 29-14 vote, one vote more than an almost identical measure received a month ago.



The vote was nearly the same as the one a month ago. Republicans Rachel Gilbert of Boise and Larry Anderson of Twin Falls, who opposed the bill earlier, supported it while Republican Phillip Burk of Boise opposed it after his predecessor Jerry Hanson supported it last time.

The earlier bill, although supported by the administration, was vetoed by Republican Lt. Gov. C.L. "Butch" Otter, who was acting as governor. "Butch" Otter was out of the state. Otter said he favored an alternate version that restored the drinking age to 19 if South Dakota wins a court challenge to the controversial 21-year-old federal mandate.

Andrus, who supports the bill during the threat that Idaho will lose millions of dollars in needed federal highway funds, has arranged his schedule to ensure that he is in the state when the bill hits his desk.

The legislation cleared the House last week by seven votes. The confrontational mood that had gripped a majority of the state Legislature in past sessions changed after Idaho was notified last fall that it would lose over \$40 million in highway money this year and double that amount next year without the higher drinking age. But some refused to acquiesce.

"As chairman of the Transportation Commit-

tee I know we need those federal highway funds," Sen. C.A. Smyser, R-Parma, said. "But as long as the issue of federal blackmail hangs over our heads, I cannot go along with it despite the loss of federal highway funds."

The bill will take effect 10 days after Andrus signs it. It allows people 19 or 20 years old the day before it takes effect to continue legally purchasing alcoholic beverages.

Arguments in the Senate were limited compared to the emotional debate of a month earlier. The minority opposition reiterated its objections to the "federal blackmail" in the threat of loss highway money if the age was raised.

Sen. Michael Blackbird, D-Kellogg, claimed Idaho was about to "prostitute state sovereignty in the name of morality for federal dollars."

But Senate President Pro Tem James Risch, R-Boise, claimed the issue was not federal blackmail but simply one of life and death. "Supporters of the higher drinking age claim it will reduce highway fatalities, but critics have argued it will only move 19 and 20 year olds 'out of the bars and back into the cars.'"

## 65 mph limit wins, 40-2

BOISE (AP) — Legislation clearing the way for the speed limit on most of Idaho's interstate highway network to be raised to 65 miles an hour has been overwhelmingly endorsed by the state Senate.

The bill, contingent on the federal government giving states the power to raise the interstate speed limits, was sent to the House on Thursday by a 40-2 vote.

"This is one federal mandate that when it becomes the law the people of the state of Idaho will be very appreciative of," Senate Transportation Chairman C.A. light, Smyser, R-Parma, said.

But the congressional legislation including the authority for states to abandon the controversial 55 mph speed limit is tied to an \$28.6 billion highway aid bill that President Reagan has indicated he will veto because it is a budget buster.

Under the Senate measure, the state Transportation Board would be able to raise the speed limit on all rural interstate highways 30 days after the federal government gives the green light.

## 'Lifeline' telephone subsidy goes to governor

BOISE (AP) — Legislation subsidizing the monthly telephone bills of thousands of needy Idaho households was sent to Governor Cecil Andrus for his signature.

The state Senate voted 26-16 for the \$4 a month subsidy on Thursday, four days after Andrus vetoed a sweeping revision in state telephone regulation that he said failed to provide enough assurance of rate stability for residential customers.

Senate action on the subsidy measure came as supporters of the deregulation bill were trying to reverse the proposal. But while negotiations were continuing, even some of the bill's supporters in-

dicated it was too late in the 1987 session for them to be successful.

Andrus called for review of the entire regulatory issue over the summer and fall with a compromise bill presented to the 1988 Legislature.

Although some supporters of the so-called "lifeline" telephone subsidy had feared the bill was jeopardized by the governor's veto of the deregulation measure, Sen. Phil Bait, R-Wilder, who strongly supported deregulation, emphasized that there was no connection.

Bait said he believed the deregulation measure would have been one of the biggest economic stimulants for the state in years, providing hun-

dreds of high-paying jobs and millions of dollars in investment.

But, he added, "If there were any books (between deregulation and the lifeline bill), they have long been filled off through extensive negotiations."

Under the bill, Idahoans 60 years and older who qualify for the federal government's Low Income Energy Assistance Program would receive the \$4 a month subsidy on their telephone bills. The program was expected to help some 11,000 people each month.

Bait said problems of eligibility should be resolved through administration of the program.

## House passes tort reform

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Senate Legislature has enacted tort reform.

It isn't the comprehensive legislation pushed by the largest coalition ever formed in Idaho to push a bill.

But it was close enough that only seven lawmakers in the 49-member House voted against it Thursday afternoon, despite a long debate and an unsuccessful attempt to amend the bill.

The Senate approved the bill 40-2 earlier, and it goes to Gov. Cecil Andrus. Andrus has called for tort reform legislation this session, although a spokesman said the governor hasn't taken a stand on this particular version.

A coalition of nearly 150 organizations, corporations and companies pushed an earlier bill, which cleared the House 65-19 but died in the

## Deaver pleads not guilty

WASHINGTON (AP) — Former White House aide Michael K. Deaver pleaded innocent Thursday to charges he led to a congressional committee and a grand jury that investigated his lobbying business for possible ethical violations.

Deaver entered his not-guilty plea during a brief appearance before U.S. District Judge Thomas Penfield Jackson, who set a trial date of June 8.

Asked if he waived a reading of the five-count indictment, Deaver said: "I do and I'm not guilty, your honor."

"Very well," said Jackson, who asked if Deaver wanted a jury trial.

"We certainly do," replied defense attorney Herbert J. Miller.

Jackson, who scheduled the trial for June 8, released Deaver, President Reagan's former deputy chief of staff, on his own recognizance.

## Rocket destroyed on launch

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — An unmanned rocket that appeared to have been hit by lightning careened out of control Thursday and was destroyed by radio signal 51 seconds after it lifted off with an \$2 million million communications satellite.

A NASA videotape clearly showed a lightning bolt descending from the vicinity of the Atlas-Centaur rocket, hidden in clouds, and striking the launch pad about the time the vehicle exploded. Launch officials, however, said they did not want to speculate on what went wrong until they analyze the data.

Floating debris from the shattered rocket and payload plunged into the Atlantic Ocean about three miles offshore. Coast Guard boats hurried to the scene to pick up any floating debris.

## Secret cellar suspect held

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — A man accused of keeping half-naked women chained in his secret cellar of horrors for torture, rape and killing, and of stockpiling human limbs in a freezer was ordered held without bond Thursday.

Only when a woman went to police Wednesday, saying she had escaped from the rundown row house in Philadelphia, did police begin to suspect something foul was in the cellar of Gary Heidnik, a 43-year-old licensed practical nurse.

Heidnik was arrested after police went to the house and found three young women, naked from the waist down, chained in the basement. They also found 24 pounds of human limbs in a freezer and other body parts in the kitchen, police said.

By day's end, police said they found the body of a woman in remote woods in southern New Jersey and arrested a second suspect, Cyril Brown, a sometime occupant of the house. Brown was charged with murdering two women.

## Reagan raps court's ruling

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan found fault Thursday with a Supreme Court decision on workplace sex discrimination, saying it has the effect of turning affirmative action into a quota system.

Leaving the White House for a trip to Columbia, Mo., Reagan was asked by reporters for his reaction

to the 6-3 decision holding that employers may take sex into account in hiring and promotion decisions.

"All our position has been is that we shouldn't let affirmative action deteriorate into a quota system that would then be counterdiscriminatory," he said.

"Obviously, I disagree with the decision, but the court made it and I'm not going to quarrel with that," Reagan said.

## Board against belts on buses

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal safety board, after studying 43 school bus accidents, recommended Thursday against equipping school buses with passenger lap belts, saying the belts probably would not reduce the chances of serious injury or death.

The findings by the National Transportation Safety Board are expected to fuel a debate over whether the estimated 22 million children who are transported by school bus daily should be protected by safety belts.

In recent years about 150 school districts, the Denver district being among the largest, have equipped at least some of their buses with lap belts. New York state will require lap belts in all new buses purchased after next July.

## Dangerous metals increasing

WASHINGTON (AP) — The effort to improve the nation's water has reduced the amount of bacteria and lead in streams and rivers, but such dangerous metals as arsenic and cadmium are on the increase, a published study says.

Impressive improvement in water quality has occurred since the passage of the Clean Water Act in 1972, particularly in light of the growth in population and industrial production in the same period, said the study to be published today in the journal Science.

Much of this gain is the result of improved sewage treatment, limiting what is called "point-source" pollution.

But other, "non-point" sources of pollution, such as agricultural chemicals, may still prevent achievement of national water quality goals, said the report by Richard A. Smith and Richard B. Alexander of the U.S. Geological Survey and H. Gordon Wolman of Johns Hopkins University. They studied the results of periodic water quality tests on nearly 300 rivers and streams from 1974 to 1981.

## Shultz confers with Nixon

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State George P. Shultz, preparing for his talks next month in Moscow, called in an experienced Kremlinologist on Thursday — former President Nixon.

"He has had a great deal of experience in U.S.-Soviet relations," said State Department spokesman Charles E. Redman.

The 75-minute session was held in late afternoon in Shultz' seventh-floor office at the State Department. It was suggested by Shultz, who is seeking the advice of other experienced Kremlin-watchers, as well.

Frank Carlucci, the White House national security adviser, joined them for a discussion of arms control, human rights and regional problems, said an official who demanded anonymity.

## President just can't dodge Iran-Contra affair at school

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) — President Reagan said Thursday that trading arms to Iran for hostages Iran issue in a question from 11-year-old Heather Watson in a sixth-grade civics class.

Reagan, trying to escape the sting of the Iran-Contra affair with a trip to this central Missouri city of 65,000, was confronted anew by the issue on his first journey out of the Washington this year.

And in his remarks, he rendered his harshest verdict yet about the arms sales arrangement carried out under his approval.

On a trip intended to focus attention on his campaign for quality education, Reagan collided with the trading arms to Iran for hostages Iran issue in a question from 11-year-old Heather Watson in a sixth-grade civics class.

"It sort of settled down to just trading arms for hostages, and that's a little like paying ransom to a kidnapper," he said.

"If you do it, then the kidnapper is just encouraged to kidnap someone else," Reagan said.

On Thursday, boarding Air Force One for the flight back to Washington, Reagan was asked what more could be done to help free American hostages in Lebanon, and he replied, "Everything we can, we're exploring."

Asked about American hostage Alann Steen, who has been said to be dying in statements by his captors and a fellow hostage, Reagan said, "Of course I'm concerned."

Aboard the plane, presidential spokesman Marlin Fitzwater said of Steen, "Of course we're greatly concerned about his welfare, and if he's sick his captors should release him."

In his answer to the girl who questioned him, Reagan said he still thought the idea behind his Iran policy was right. However, noting that things went awry, he added, "I won't make that mistake again."

The girl was the only questioner Reagan called on during a visit to Fairview Elementary School.

## Sergeant facing more charges of espionage

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Marine Corps has brought additional charges against Sgt. Clayton J. Lonetree, the first of two Marine security guards arrested on suspicion of spying while working at the U.S. Embassy in Moscow, Pentagon sources said Thursday.

The sources said the new charges were "directly related to the surface matter only if not identified, the decision to add five additional charges to the 19 counts Moscow for roughly eight months already pending had been prompted by the recent arrest of another guard, Cpl. Arnold Bracy."

The sources declined to discuss the specific allegations underlying the new charges. But they said the charges included another count of espionage; two counts of conspiracy to commit espionage; and two counts of "espionage-related" general misconduct charges.

## Crews bring bodies of 2 off mountain

MARCH AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. (AP) — Rescue crews airlifted the remains of entertainer Dean Martin's son off a mountain Thursday along with the body of his crewman and the wreckage of their jet, while friends remembered him as "the finest kind of person."

Dean Paul Martin, 35, and fellow California Air National Guard Capt. Ramon Ortiz, 39, were killed when their F-4 Phantom crashed and exploded Saturday. The wreckage was found Wednesday after an intense five-day search.

The jet plunged nearly 4,000 feet from its last radar reading of 6,300 feet to slam into the side of the granite mountain at about 400 mph.

There was no indication of a malfunction with the jet, said Air National Guard Maj. Steve Mensik, and Sgt. Carolyn Hamilton said the victims made no attempt to eject.

It could take weeks for Air Force investigation teams to reconstruct the jet, which crashed in Wood Canyon in the San Bernardino Mountains.

Mensik said the bodies were to be returned to the base and that the families would make funeral arrangements.

# Idahoan carries taped appeal for trade

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Hostage Jesse Turner of Boise, Idaho, said on a videotape released Thursday that Alann Steen is dying, and urged the United States and Israel to accept a prisoner exchange for his fellow American captive's release.

Their kidnappers, who said Monday that Steen was near death, want to trade him for 100 Arab prisoners held in Israel and demand that the United States persuade the Israelis. Both governments have refused the deal.

"You all know that our fellow Alann Steen is dying," Turner said in a five-minute videotape delivered to the offices of the leftist daily newspaper *As-Safir* in Moslem west Beirut.

"The doctor says in his report that: 'After checking the patient Alann Steen I found out that he had a crisis in his blood pressure 23-18.

The symptoms he had were headache, hemiparesis, anxiety and difficulty in breathing," what he meant by hemiparesis. A similar sounding condition, hemiparesis, is defined in Dorland's Illustrated Medical Dictionary as "muscular weakness affecting one side of the body."

"There was no indication whether this was the illness in question. Normal adult blood pressure is about 120 over 80 and a reading of 23 over 18 would indicate a life-threatening low blood pressure. American doctors said Thursday, however, that the hostage's reading may have been expressed in European measurement. That would correspond to 230 over 180, an extremely high blood pressure. A typewritten English text of Turner's statement accompanied the videotape.

Turner said a videotape of Steen

"will be taped soon. If he is in good condition Alann will be taking," Steen and Turner's captors, who call themselves Islamic Jihad for the Liberation of Palestine, said Monday that Steen might die within 10 days and promised to make his condition clear in a videotape by Thursday.

Virginia Rose Steen, the hostage's wife, told reporters Thursday: "We called the doctor about the statement and the medication in the statement. The doctor who was called in called for his immediate release so he can be in a hospital. Anybody under these medications should be in hospital."

Turner said: "America and Israel must ask the Islamic Jihad Organization for the Liberation of Palestine to send its lists of names and they must show good will and behave in the right way."

"We urge our wives and families to go to America and Israel and press

there because the keys of our issue are there. Moving in Lebanon is useless. You must press on America for the sake of Alann Steen."

"We ask the American people and our families to press on our administration to make sure that we will be released alive."

In Israel, Foreign Ministry spokesman Avih Shik "On said: "We can only hope that Steen and his fellow hostages will be freed ... Neither the United States nor anyone else has approached us or placed any pressure on us."

"Our position on hostages and terrorism in general is well known. I only hope that if Steen's situation is really this bad, his kidnappers will make a humanitarian gesture and free him."

Turner was shown from the waist up, bearded and wearing a white T-shirt. His voice was steady and he appeared to be in good health.

## Talks on eliminating Europe missile recess

GENEVA (AP) — Superpower talks on eliminating nuclear missile-range missiles in Europe recessed Thursday, and the Soviet Union accused the United States of blocking progress by clinging to an "unconstructive" position.

At the same time, officials on both sides described the talks as useful and said some progress has been made.

The United States and the Soviet Union remain at odds over whether shorter-range missiles should be included in an agreement on medium-range missiles.

The United States wants the linkage, saying the Soviet Union has shorter-range rockets in Eastern Europe while the United States has none in Western Europe. The Soviets oppose a package deal.

The Soviet deputy chief arms negotiator, Alexei Obukhov, blamed the United States for standing in the way of "rapid progress" because of "unconstructive" elements in the U.S. position.

He said his delegation hoped "adjustments will be made in the U.S. position to free it from everything that not consistent with the objective of promptly reaching an effective accord."

Still, he said, the two sides have "been doing useful work," such as working on phrases to be included in a joint draft treaty on medium-range missiles.

He would not elaborate or say whether the Soviets planned to present their own draft treaty during the next round, scheduled to begin April 22.

# Peres tells Arabs time for peace is here

JERUSALEM — Foreign Minister Shimon Peres fielded questions from Arabs in a live call-in radio program Thursday and said it would be better to "share the government" than to divide the Israeli-occupied West Bank and Gaza Strip.

"The time has come to make peace," said Peres. "Despite our differences we can talk as neighbors and talk sense, even if not face to face, then voice to voice."

The state-owned radio's Arabic language news show broadcast the 105-minute program. About 100 Arab questioners called the radio's studio in Jerusalem from West Germany, and questions from about 30 were broadcast.

The callers were from Jordan, Egypt, Lebanon, Israel and Israeli-occupied territories. Some calls came from Syria and Persian Gulf

states but were not broadcast. Radio officials declined to say why.

Israel radio's Arabic channel is heard daily in neighboring Arab countries. Most still are technically at war with Israel.

Most questioners pressed Peres, a former prime minister from the left-leaning Labor Party, about his peace policies.

Peres repeatedly defended Israel's refusal to talk with the Palestine Liberation Organization, which Israel considers a terrorist group.

But he proposed a way out of a year-long deadlock in peace efforts.

"When you have two people living on the same land you can either divide the land or share the government," Peres said in response to a question by an Israeli Arab.

"It looks to me that the best bet right now is to share the gov-

ernment, so the Palestinians will live in dignity, peace, equality, and Israel will be able to secure her own defenses," he said.

Peres referred to a compromise proposal to build a confederation between Israel and Jordan to share administration of the occupied territories. The plan is aimed at resolving the dispute over the land Israel captured in 1967. Palestinians are demanding a sovereign state in the territory, home to 1.4 million Palestinians and 55,000 Israelis.

"The Arabs are not our enemies," Peres said. "The only enemy we have is belligerency and war."

Peres told a questioner from Jordan who requested anonymity that he wants talks to start "immediately without preconditions."

# Soldiers post guard at school

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador (AP) — Soldiers on Thursday guarded the empty grammar school where two teen-agers armed with guns and a grenade and claiming to be guerrillas held 947 children hostage for 6½ hours the day before.

The armed forces press office said that the standoff Wednesday, which ended when the teen-agers surrendered and released the students unharmed, marked an increase in leftist guerrilla attacks in the capital.

But there were doubts one of the teen-agers, identified as 17-year-old army deserter Juan Francisco Medrano Iraheta, was ever part of the Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front. His comments were filled with contradictions that indicated he may have been afraid of being taken by the military.

Medrano Iraheta and his companion, Gloria Escobar Guzman, 16, were in Treasury Police custody Thursday. A spokesman said an investigation was under way but no charges had been filed.

About 25 soldiers remained outside the block-long San Juan school. Classes were canceled and only teachers were in the building assessing damage. Principal Arely de Flores said it would remain closed until Monday, and she would arrange counseling for students.

"He was just crazy without any experience," she said of Medrano Iraheta. "He was trapped and had no other alternative because he had already deserted the army and they were looking for him."

She also said the youth was "a product of the war. In the country, we are losing moral values. Undoubtedly the war is responsible for all this."

# Quake rocks resort area

ACAPULCO, Mexico (AP) — A moderate earthquake rattled this popular Pacific resort on Thursday, but there were no reports of damage or anyone being hurt, a city government spokeswoman said.

The National Autonomous University said the quake registered a magnitude of 5 in the open-ended Richter scale at its Tacubaya seismographic station in Mexico City.

It said the epicenter was located just a few miles off the coast in the Pacific Ocean.

"The quake lasted about 50 seconds, and it mostly scared people. We have no reports of any damage or injuries," a city spokeswoman Josefina Pena said in a telephone interview.

A report put out by the university said the earth movement began at 12:38 p.m. MST.

## Calm prevails at parents' meeting on AIDS

KETCHUM — Tough questions were asked, but the mood remained calm, as about 85 people attended a parents' meeting Thursday night to discuss the possibility of a child with AIDS attending Hemingway Elementary School in Ketchum.

Most of the parents' questions revolved around the same theme: Could their children contract the fatal syndrome if the AIDS patient were admitted to the school?

Two weeks ago, the family of a child with AIDS requested immediate admission to Hemingway.

Blaine County School Superintendent Dave Noonan refused admission then. Instead he created an evaluation team to study the case and make a recommendation to the Blaine County Board of Trustees, as required by the district's written policy on AIDS passed this fall.

Thursday, the districts invited parents to air their concerns. On hand to answer questions were Noonan, Hemingway Principal Micah Fierstein, Ketchum pediatrician Julie O'Toole, school district attorney Rand Peebles and president of the Hemingway Parent Auxiliary, Joanne Levy.

Ketchum resident Michael Saphier asked if children could contract the disease if "the

(AIDS) virus is on a desktop or bus seat or apple."

O'Toole said that the amount of virus on such objects would be far too small to pose any danger of AIDS being passed along to another person.

Other parents were concerned that their children might be exposed to the virus through tears or saliva. Again, O'Toole said that although the AIDS virus has been found in saliva, the amount is too small for a child to contract the syndrome.

O'Toole told parents that there are only three ways to contract AIDS — through sexual intercourse, the exchange of blood or before birth.

She said that parents, including herself, should be more concerned about older kids in the school system and less concerned about the grade school children who have a minute chance of getting AIDS.

"Some kids at Wood River Junior High School and certainly kids at Wood River High School, like it or not, sleep together, and they will get AIDS if they sleep with a carrier of the AIDS virus," she said.

O'Toole and Peebles both said it was unfortunate that AIDS had a "sex" stigma attached to it.

"It's a slur on AIDS, like it's a different kind of disease," O'Toole said.

Darryl McMillen, parent of a sixth grader,

said, "My child went to a party not long ago and they played spin the bottle. That's the game where they kiss. What do we tell our kids if they have a friend who has AIDS? Do we tell our kids to invite this kid?"

O'Toole said there should be no problem if a child with AIDS attends such a party, since there have been no documented cases of AIDS transmitted by kissing or other forms of casual contact.

Other parents, though, objected to O'Toole's comments, saying that there have been some anomalous cases of AIDS transmission. One man asked why some companies had refused to hire AIDS patients. If the

## Campaign disclosure bill gets a second look

BOISE — The Idaho House on Thursday killed a bill to change reporting requirements of political campaign contributions, but later voted to reconsider the measure.

"I think there was a substantial misunderstanding, and we have new information available," said Rep. Sam Clark, R-Pocatello.

"He's being nice," said Rep. Janet Hay, R-Nampa, who carried the bill. "I did a lousy job of explaining, and I'd like a second chance to set the record straight."

The first vote was 43-35 to kill the bill in the House. It had earlier passed the Senate, 27-15.

The House later voted 65-17 to reconsider.

The bill would close the loophole in reporting out-of-state campaign contributions, requiring political action committees to disclose the names of people who contribute to out-of-state PACs.

The bill would also require the winners in primary elections to file a campaign disclosure statement after the primary.

The third provision would raise the minimum reporting amount from \$50 to \$200 on out-of-state contributions, to bring Idaho in line with federal election laws.

Hay, during debate, mistakenly said the \$50 amount would apply to in-state contributions.

Opposition varied on the bill.

Rep. Jerry Colten, R-Jerome, said he saw no purpose in making the winners in a primary election report one more time, as winning candidates must report before a November general election.

Rep. Mack Neibaur, R-Paul, said more reporting "was just one more way for the news media" to take potshots.

But Neibaur later said he also opposed raising the limit to \$200, because it allowed more people to contribute bigger sums without forcing candidates to disclose the names of contributors.

## Prosecuting attorney in Jerome resigns

JEROME — Jerome County Prosecuting Attorney Mark Gause has announced he will resign, effective April 16, because of financial considerations.

"I got an offer I couldn't refuse, managing a small corporation that will involve working in both Idaho and California," he said. Gause declined to name the corporation, saying it wouldn't be fair to the company's competitors.

Gause said work for his new employer will be managerial in nature and that he will not be performing any legal duties.

"However, I do plan to maintain my license to practice law in Idaho," Gause said.

While controversy has surrounded some of his decisions during his two-year term as prosecuting attorney, Gause said that had nothing to do with his decision to resign.

"I would say 80 percent of the reason I decided to pursue this other career was financial in nature. 10 percent of the reason I resigned can be attributed to the lack of cooperation I have gotten from some law enforcement officials in the past. The lack of law enforcement cooperation makes the prosecutor's office less attractive," Gause said.

Chief Deputy Sheriff Larry Webb told The Times-News that law enforcement officials have "always tried to work and cooperate" with the prosecuting attorney's office.

"We have disagreed with the way some of the cases have been prosecuted, but we have always cooperated. We never held anything back in an investigation," Webb said.

A recall petition drive was launched against Gause last year, when he received a charge against a Hazelton couple from manslaughter to a misdemeanor. The couple, Gary and Rosemarie Staten, were convicted on a misdemeanor charge of injury to a child when their 11-month old daughter, Tanya Lynne, died from a combination of malnutrition and bronchial pneumonia.

The recall petition, however, was eventually withdrawn because organizers fell far short of obtaining the required number of signatures.

More recently, 5th District Judge Phillip Becker dismissed six felony charges brought against Timothy Alger, who was accused of wounding a Twin Falls police officer in a gun battle.

Gause failed to bring the case to trial for at least 10 months, violating Alger's right to a speedy trial, Becker said.

Gause said at the time that he was not aware of the Idaho statute requiring a trial within six months. Alger was sentenced to prison terms in Ada County and Washington, however.

Thursday, Gause, the county's first full-time prosecuting attorney, said at least four persons have ex-

## Phone deregulation goes for parting shot

BOISE — Mountain Bell will make one last stab at getting a phone deregulation bill through the Legislature today, although backers have been told it has little chance of passage.

"The governor basically said 'don't bother,'" said Sen. Bruce Sweeney, D-Lewiston, who met with Andrus briefly on Thursday.

But Mountain Bell is bithering, even as opponents geared up to defeat the measure again. The revised version is on the House State Affairs agenda today.

Backers are hoping it will meet the demands of Gov. Cecil Andrus who vetoed another phone deregulation bill last week.

However, Committee chairwoman Rep. Pam Bengson said the measure did not have a high priority on today's agenda.

"It's the kind of thing that should receive some close scrutiny," Bengson said.

The new bill surfaced on Thursday, during an 8 a.m. State Affairs Committee meeting. Although it was scheduled on the agenda, sponsor Rep. Janet Hay, R-Nampa, and Rep. Steve Herndon, D-Sandpoint, withdrew it to let consumer groups have a chance to read it.

The new proposal would eliminate a controversial \$1-a-year increase on monthly rates, which would have been allowed without RUC approval under the old measure.

The new measure also would eliminate pricing flexibility, included in the vetoed bill to help independent phone companies.

But independent companies were



not given a copy of the new proposal by Mountain Bell.

The bill would retain the Universal Service Fund, a statewide subsidy to help pay for rural phone service.

The new version was a tightly kept secret for part of the day. Sponsors released only one copy, and asked opponents not to make copies of the proposed new bill or leak its contents.

However, by the end of the day, numerous copies were floating around the Statehouse. And at 5 p.m., workers in the Governor's Office said they had received close to 200 calls, mostly from senior citizens, with the message: "Please stand firm."

After reviewing the bill, consumer groups said they could not support the new measure, even though it left single-line service under the Public Utilities Commission.

"It still could conceivably reduce the base and shift costs onto the single-line customer," said John O. Stocks, lobbyist for Idaho-Fair Share, a consumer group.

Mountain Bell lobbyist Bill Roden said, late Thursday afternoon, that the bill was written to meet "the Governor's stated objections."

Andrus said he vetoed the bill because it "placed" the universal

## Minidoka County News shuts doors

BURLEY — The Minidoka County News masthead is fading off the front page into retirement, after 58 years on the street every week.

The daily South Idaho Press, its larger sister paper, will absorb the Rupert-based weekly on April 1, said John Eberline, president of parent company South Idaho Newspapers Inc.

Eberline announced the merger to both papers on Wednesday, describing the change as a move to improve marketing and to eliminate duplication of news. Subscribers also were notified by mail.

In its place, the SIP will focus on the area's news with a Minidoka County page three times a week on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. The first pages appear April 1.

The Minidoka County News circulated to about 4,000 subscribers, SIP Managing Editor Mike Feller said Thursday. However, two-thirds of those already were taking the SIP, and they were seeing much of the same news in both papers.

An in-house survey of news published over 6 months also found that close to 80 percent of the articles in the Minidoka County News were duplicated in the SIP, he said.

"Actually, the primary problem we were having was every time the South Idaho Press picked up a subscriber, the

Minidoka County News lost one," Feller said.

Readers and advertisers of the Minidoka County News have asked for more timely reports, Eberline said. They also are seeking regional coverage offered by the SIP's broader circulation, Feller said Thursday.

The company is moving quickly to keep the weekly's subscribers, offering them 4 free months of the SIP or an extension of their existing SIP subscriptions.

The merger of the Minidoka County News into the SIP is the final phase of a consolidation begun at least a decade ago. Although the Minidoka County News maintained an office and two-person news staff in Rupert, its parent South Idaho Newspapers had consolidated most business operations and printed the weekly in Burley.

The news staff also used the SIP's computer system and worked closely with its reporters, Feller said. The paper's editor, Kary Miller, and Sports Editor Dave Wilkins will join the SIP staff and specialize in Minidoka County news.

The merger ends an 81-year tradition of home-based publishing in the county.

The Rupert Record first appeared in 1905 and was followed by at least four other newspapers. But from 1915-1919, three separate papers were published, changing the lineage.

The Minidoka County News first came out in 1919 "as a continuation of

## Windstorm kicks up power outages, dust

TWIN FALLS — Westerly winds gusting through Magic Valley Thursday at speeds up to 60 miles an hour, causing power outages and driving hazards for motorists on interstate and state highways.

Idaho Power Co. repair crews were busy with numerous small service disruptions due to winds, and one major problem during the morning was blamed on wind.

A brief power outage, shortly after 9 a.m., affected all Idaho Power Co. customers in the Magic and Wood River valleys, said a company spokesman.

Most people saw their lights blink on and off, but 3,300 customers in east Twin Falls and the Kimberly area experienced a longer outage, said Dale Monson, IPC division electrical superintendent.

The outage occurred at 9:21 a.m. and service was restored to the last of the customers affected by 9:47 a.m., Monson said.

The outage knocked KLLX radio off the air at 9:21 a.m. The station was back on the air at 9:35 a.m., with the help of an emergency generator, said Jerry Marcantonio, KLLX news director.

The outage was caused by the failure of insulating material on one of IPC's transmission lines, Monson said. This allowed one line to drop down across the other and caused the blinking, he said.

Power was rerouted through other lines while IPC made repairs on the damaged area, Monson said.

State Police officers said thick

clouds of dust were blowing across highways from farm fields, some of them newly plowed this spring.

Dispatchers reported no serious accidents but said a warning describing wind conditions as hazardous was in effect for Magic Valley and the Snake River Plain. All motorists were urged to watch for dust and strong winds, especially those operating broad surface vehicles such as trucks, trailers and recreation vehicles.

Area police and sheriff's officers said no serious wind damage had been reported by late afternoon.

At the Twin Falls-Sun Valley Regional Airport, south-of-Twin Falls, tower traffic controller Scott Stapp said winds were measured at around 49 mph about 2:30 p.m. He said the winds did not hamper commercial flights.

"The wind was blowing in the right direction — straight down the runway — so it didn't cause any problems for the bigger planes," Stapp said. "Some of the lighter aircraft was bouncing around, and not too many small planes were coming in or going out."

Fomerelle ski area, south of Burley, only the center lift was operating Thursday, because of the wind.

"We didn't open the big (longer and higher) lift this morning. We knew it was too windy to operate."

IPC said resort Manager Jody Anderson said Pomerelle, with another 5 inches of snow this week.

Normal lift operations were reported at Sun Valley, but mountain personnel could not be reached to determine whether some lifts had been closed because of winds.

# School must pay illiterate student

**BOSTON (AP)** — A school district that awarded a high school diploma to a woman who could not read but cheated her way to the top of the class has been ordered to pay \$17,000 she spent for remedial education.

Karen Morse, who is dyslexic, is in college now but to people in her hometown of Hemlock, N.H., her high school education is very much a public issue.

School Board members will not say if they will appeal the ruling by the New Hampshire Department of Education ordering payment for the special school Morse attended after high school.

They have 30 days to respond.

"We'll wait and see if the town feels strongly to go one way or the other," said School Board member Bob Konze. He said the board members have "pretty much made up our minds."

While Konze refused to disclose which way the board is leaning on the Morse matter, he said they expect to ask for \$17,000 to be tacked onto the next budget as "an unforeseen special education expense."

Morse, 20, a freshman at Salem State College, said "a few people in our town" of 5,100 have indicated they are not happy with the decision. But she is saving her victory.

"It's a big decision for special education," she said in a telephone interview from her Massachusetts college. The ruling, she said, "should make school districts think twice."

In ninth grade Morse was diagnosed as being learning disabled. But it was two years more before her problem was identified as dyslexia, an impairment in the ability to identify letters and words.

For nine years she had hidden from teachers and friends her inability to read. She carried on her charade by cheating, mostly by taking papers from other pupils and erasing their names, she said.

Her ruse succeeded. She was elected president of her senior class, president of the student council and to the National Honor Society. She was captain of the girls' soccer team, won letters in two other sports and was voted the student with the "most school spirit."

It wasn't until her senior year that she received any remedial help, Morse said. That year she was assigned a tutor.

"She gave a speech at high school graduation in 1984 but refused to accept a diploma or formally graduate in an effort to get Hemlock High School to pay her tuition at Landmark School in Beverly, which specializes in teaching dyslexics."

After a year at Landmark, the school recommended she spend another year there to prepare for college. However, Hemlock's new superintendent refused to pay for further education and mailed Morse her diploma.

New Alice Vartanian, a hearing officer for New Hampshire's Department of Education, has ordered Hemlock to pay tuition for the second year. She also instructed the school district to re-examine its process of determining when special education is required.

In the meantime, Morse has been enjoying college, where she is studying elementary education. "I did pretty well in my first semester," she said.

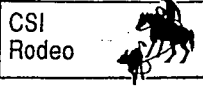

### Padres sale clouds future for Seattle

SEATTLE (AP) — George Argros' announcement Thursday that he is buying the Los Angeles Padres and selling the Seattle Mariners led to speculation that Seattle could lose its second major-league baseball franchise in less than two decades.

Argros, a Southern California land-developer who purchased the Mariners from the team's original group of owners in 1981, negotiated a new lease agreement for use of the Kingdome in 1985.

The agreement contains an exit clause allowing the Mariners' owners, no matter who they are, to move the franchise if the club doesn't draw a combined 2.8 million fans in 1986 and 1987. The Mariners drew one million fans last season.

After just one season in the city, in 1985, the American League's Seattle Pilots became the Milwaukee Brewers. Seattle was granted a second A1 franchise in 1976 as a result of a lawsuit filed following the Pilots' departure.

"I am really concerned and sincere about trying to find local ownership," Argros told a hastily called news conference at a downtown Seattle hotel. "If that's not possible, I'm obviously going to have to consider other offers."

"But I'm sure that baseball can stay right here in Seattle and be successful."

However, Seattle Mayor Charles Royer said the city should be worried.

"I'm surprised and disappointed at this announcement, because it once again puts the future of professional baseball in Seattle in question," he said.

"I am committed to doing everything I can to keep the Mari-

ners in Seattle. My staff has already started discussions with community leaders and other government officials, and we are exploring all possibilities for local ownership."

"I don't know how much time there is," Mariners President Chuck Armstrong said when asked whether he would be interested in purchasing the franchise to drive to find local ownership.

"I think if I had six or nine months, I could do it."

But Armstrong said Argros wants to sell the franchise immediately.

"I don't know how much it's going to take," he said. "Mr. Argros won't tell me what it's worth."

"It comes as a surprise, but it's a wonderful opportunity for our local community," said King County Executive Tim Hill, who signed the lease agreement that gave the Mariners their exit clause.

"There's a good possibility we could have local ownership... I have no idea if anyone in particular is interested in purchasing the team, but the business community has been supportive."

However, Hill cautioned that Argros "has said that he has to be able to purchase the Padres first before being able to sell the Mariners. A lot of things have to happen before he can sell the Mariners."

Asked whether the county or some other public agency might be interested in owning the club, Hill replied, "I don't think that's within the realm of possibility at this time."

The measure sponsored by the Seattle Democrat doesn't specifically mention the Mariners. It would give authority to any city or county to own a sports franchise.

### Southern Mississippi wins NIT

#### Nebraska takes consolation prize

NEW YORK (AP) — Derrek Hamilton scored 10 of his 17 points during a 16-4 streak that lifted Southern Mississippi to the state's first Division I postseason basketball championship, an 84-80 decision over La Salle on Thursday night in the 50th National Invitation Tournament final.

Earlier, Brian Carr scored 18 points and hit the first basket as Nebraska outscored Arkansas-Little Rock 11-2 in overtime, giving the Cornhuskers a 76-67 victory and third place.

Hamilton had two 3-point goals during the spurt that gave the Golden Eagles, 23-11, a 59-48 lead with 10:13 left. Hamilton had three 3-pointers for the game and Casey Fisher had 19 points on six long-range shots.

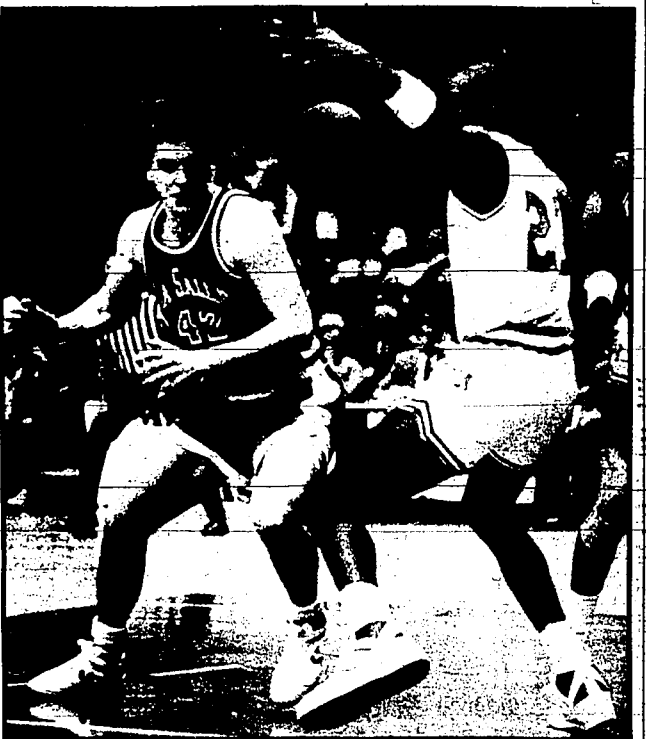
Southern Miss, which had 11 3-pointers, La Salle, 20-13, had three comebacks that fell short in the closing minutes, led by freshman star Lionel Simmons, who had 34 points.

But ultimately the Explorers died from 3-point range, making only four of 24 for the game after hitting nine of 15 in the semifinals against Arkansas-Little Rock.

After Hamilton's spurt, Simmons had five of La Salle's seven consecutive points that got the Explorers within three. They also got as close as 64-61 with 7:25 left before Fisher hit two 3-pointers to help Southern Miss gain a 77-67 advantage.

Again, La Salle tried to catch up, with three baskets by Simmons, two free throws by Rich Tarr and a rebound basket by Craig Conlin making it 82-80 with 21 seconds to go. After La Salle got the ball back on a five-second violation, Tim Legier missed a potential tying shot.

John White then made two free throws with six seconds remaining, clinching the victory.

TWIN FALLS — The College of Southern Idaho's track teams should score pretty well in some individual events, but the matter of team victories could be something else.

Highlighted by the return of national champion and record-holder Joey Johnson, the Eagles will make their only showing of the season Saturday at Twin Falls' Bruns Stadium.

Coach Rick Nell said the meet will wind up a dual between his Golden Eagles and Northwest Nazarene College.

"We are disappointed. Last year we had five teams for this meet. But the way the calendar fell this year, most of the teams are on spring break and unable to bring teams," said Nell.

Competing with regular could be the strength of the men's team. With Johnson, a sophomore from San Pedro, Calif., and the current national junior record-holder, it's almost a cinch win in the high jump. Nell is adding another member of the national champion basketball team in Keith Reynolds, a freshman from Springfield, Ore., who has bettered 24 feet in the long jump and will be tried in the high jump. Additionally, Wendell freshman Jay Burke brings a 5-6 best to the high jump and that could make it the strongest event in the field arsenal.

Nell said the sprint corps is divided into short and long more than 100-meter races.

The second 100-meter men in Horace Dove-Edwin, a freshman from Ghana; Ken Raluge, a sophomore from Aurora, Colo.; and Wes



Gullory, a freshman from Beaumont, Texas. The longer sprints will display Charles Tennant, a freshman from Buhl, and Todd Schutte, a sophomore from Kimberly, both of who qualified for national indoor finals.

Freshman Robert McGovern of Dublin, Ireland, holds the distance corps' best times, but Nell sees improvement from Todd McKay, a freshman from Weston; Mike Ranieri, a freshman from Boise; Rick Valder, a sophomore from Twin Falls, and Dylan Deckard, a freshman from Hailley.

Twin Falls sophomore Doug Zakalyk is in for the busiest spring, designated "our resident decathlete" by Nell.

Zakalyk, the best hurdler in Twin Falls High School history and second best in state history, will compete in five events per meet through the regional decathlon April 17. After that he will concentrate on the hurdles.

Burke will join him in the hurdles along with Jerome freshman Rob Bartholomew.

After the jumping, CSI doesn't have a lot of field event depth.

Lance Canning, a freshman from Missoula, Mont., has hit 211 feet in the javelin and shows promise in the hammer where he will have the chances to compete this year.

Blair Patton, a freshman from Cascade, Mont., and Thayne Baker, another Montana frosh, and ex-Bruin Cliff Gordon are in the 15- to 14-foot range in the pole vault.

Pacatiello sophomore Cliff Hudson again will handle the triple jump.

The women's team strength appears on the track, headed by sophomore Teresa Wright of Kimberly and freshman Rhonda Ferkovich of Butte. Mont. Wright will stick with the 200 and 400 this year while Ferkovich, who has a 2:18 half mile to her credit, will run the 800 and 1500. Idalia Casiano, a freshman from Heburn, will try the heptathlon through April 17 and then concentrated on the 400 and 800.

CSI's sprinters will be freshmen Debbie Esplin of Shelley and Becky Hinton of Emmett.

Oralia Casiano, Heburn, will specialize in the 800 and Amy Athey, an Oregonian seriously training for a marathon career, will handle the 5,000- and 10,000-meter runs. Hailley's Michelle Jaques will go in the middle distances.

CSI's field events will be limited largely to the javelin, discus and shot put and those duties will be divided up among freshmen Stephanie Hall of Pacatiello, Sandra Kulle of Mountain Home and Julie Hibbard of Shoshone.

### Three-point field goal helped UNLV, Providence into finals

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Some basketball coaches agree that Nevada-Las Vegas and Providence might not be in the NCAA Final Four if not for the 3-point goal.

But playing by the new rule instituted this season, Providence and Las Vegas, with more outside shooters than most teams, rank 1-2 in making the 19-foot-9-inch goals per game.

"It helped some teams, that's for sure — UNLV and Providence," said Pittsburgh Coach Paul Evans Thursday. His Panthers beat Providence twice during the regular Big East season.

"The 3-point goal really benefited Providence because they haven't a lot of inside players," said Michigan Coach Bill Frieder.

Whether the championship game will be a shootout between UNLV and Providence remains to be seen.

In Saturday's first game of the Superdome double-header, No. 10 Syracuse, 30-6, takes on Providence, Syracuse basically relies on one 3-point player, Greg Monroe, and has made 93 of 230.

UNLV, with Freddie Banks and Gerald Paddo leading the way, has thrown up 746 baskets, making 40 percent. Banks made 142 and Paddo 85.

The Runnin' Rebels, coached by Jerry Tarkanian, are on the biggest roll of all with a 22-game winning streak in quest of their first NCAA crown.

Providence hit 43 percent of its long-range shots on 275 of 646. Billy Donovan, 38; Ernie "Pop" Lewis, 94 and Delray Brooks, 65, head the Friar 3-point makers.

The Friars finished fourth in the Big East regular season and are the lowest seed (No. 5 in the Southeast) to get this far. Both UNLV (West) and Indiana (Midwest) were No. 1 seeds and Syracuse (East) was the No. 2 seed.

In a sampling of coaches who are meeting in New Orleans in connection with the Final Four, most agreed that both games were tussles.

"It's wide open, a tough call," said Frieder, who added that he picks Big Ten rival Indiana and Syracuse to win. "Indiana has been in every game this season and (Syracuse's) Seikaly is playing extremely well."

Southern California Coach George Raveling said, "It's a strong Final Four. Any team has a good shot at winning it. (Indiana Coach) Bobby Knight's tough with a week to prepare. (Providence Coach) Rick Pitino's on a roll."

"Vegas not only has a good offense but a good defensive and rebounding team. The 3-point rule has helped Vegas and Providence and helped Syracuse because it opened things

up inside for Seikaly."

Oregon State's Ralph Miller, the dean of Division I coaches, said, "Any four teams are capable of winning. It's whose game is on. Like Tarkanian said, it takes a little luck. With North Carolina and Villanova the last few years (NCAA champions in 1983 and 1985), who knows?"

Coach John Thompson, whose team beat Syracuse in the Big East tournament final, said of the Orangemen-Providence game: "It's very unpredictable when you have two league teams. It's like the NBA when teams play best-of-five or seven. You never sweep the other team. Syracuse is in a tough situation. They already won twice. It's psychologically tough to win a third."

Thompson saw the UNLV-Indiana game as one of contrasting styles.

"Jerry tends to run a lot. Bobby has a great half-court offense. I'm not about to make any predictions," he said.

Of those coaches interviewed, only Evans had a strong view on the outcomes, picking Indiana and Syracuse to meet in the title game.

"Probably Syracuse's inside game will take its toll on Providence. When Bobby Knight has a week to prepare, he can beat anybody."

And the winner will be? "I hope for Syracuse," Evans said, "but probably Indiana."

Knight has two NCAA crowns.

# Storm, penalties mar tourney

PONTE VEDRA, Fla. (AP) — Greg Norman's last-hole birdie putt on Thursday in the storm-disrupted, penalty-littered and uncompleted first round of the \$1-million Tournament Players Championship.

Norman, the Australian who dominated world golf last year, came back from a one-hour, 20-minute storm delay and dropped a 4-foot putt for the birdie that lifted him into the overnight lead alone at 5-under-par 67.

Half the field of 144 was stranded on the Tournament Players Club at Sawgrass by a series of storms. They marked their positions on the rain-soaked course and were scheduled to return at 7:30 a.m., EST Friday to complete first-round play.

Second-round starting times Friday were pushed back by two hours as rain threatened. The field will not be able to complete play before darkness. They, too, will come back Saturday morning to finish second-round play.

Of the players stranded on the course, South African Bobby Coy was three under par through 10 holes. George Burns and Fred Wadsworth each were three under through eight. Lee Trevino was two under after only four holes.

While Norman was taking the lead, two more of golf's big stars — U.S. Open champion Ray Floyd and Steve Ballisteros of Spain — were taking a series of unusual penalties.

Each was penalized two strokes for hitting practice balls from alongside the sixth tee during the first storm delay in early afternoon.

The rules specify that practice shots can be played only from a designated area, i.e., the practice range.

"After the rain, we went back out to No. 6 and I asked Raymond if it was okay for us to bill some

practice balls," Ballisteros said. "He said, 'sure, sure.'"

"Then an official comes up and says, 'sorry, you can't do that. It's two shots.'"

"So I say to Raymond, 'sure, sure — I four strokes,'" Ballisteros said. "It was just one of those things that happen in golf," shrugged Ballisteros.

For Floyd, however, it was two of those things that happen in golf.

Floyd also got a 3-shot penalty, this on the 11th hole, for hitting a shot into his own golf bag.

"Very unlucky," said Ballisteros. "Probably more difficult than making a hole-in-one."

Floyd's caddy had placed the bag on its side along the fairway drive in that direction and began rolling toward the bag.

His caddy saw it, and began a race to move the bag. He lost the race. The ball rolled into the bag.

"Where's the ball?" Floyd asked when he reached the area. "In there," said the caddy, pointing to the golf bag.

Floyd, who finished with a 74, incurred a fifth penalty shot for the dismal day with a drive into the water.

When he was approached for comment later, Floyd forestalled any questions with a sharp "not now."

Ballisteros, five under par before the penalty, finished with a 70.

Hale Irwin, a two-time U.S. Open winner, led a large group of early finishers at 68, one shot behind Norman.

Also at that figure, four under par, were Dave Stockton, Isao Aoki of Japan, Hal Sutton, Mark O'Meara, Paul Kasper, Dan Foltz, Mark Brooks, Darl Rummells and Blaine McCallister.

# NFL players stay low key on strike talk

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The NFL Players Association opened its convention on a low-key note Thursday with most of the players attending expressing optimism that the union can avoid a repeat of the 57-day strike that eliminated seven games from the 1982 season.

Gene Ushaw, the executive director of the union, said a total of 467 players, an estimated 70 of them, had registered for the half-day session, which was adjourned so the players could participate in a golf tournament — and their wives could attend a tea party at the home of comedian Bob Hope. However, no official attendance list was made available.

Most of those present conceded the mood was less militant than at the last convention, in March of 1982 at Albuquerque, N.M., which set the stage for the strike six months later. A total of 537 registered for that meeting.

"It's not as intense as it was then," said linebacker Joel Williams of the Atlanta Falcons, who also attended the Albuquerque session. "A lot of the guys were pretty then. Now they're a lot more laid back."

Tight end John Spagnola of the Philadelphia Eagles noted that the issues are different now — from an average of \$83,000 in 1982 to about \$230,000 now. And he noted that while the word "strike" is being used, it's not because the players want one.

"It's unfortunate that word has to be used, but it isn't tossed around in meetings now," he said. "It's ultimate leverage we have like the United States having the nuclear bomb. The fact that it exists allows us to sit down and negotiate."

"When we leave here, the players will say 'sure a strike is possible,'" said quarterback Warren Moon of the Houston Oilers. "But if things are done right in the negotiations, we won't have to worry about it."

The session, which was closed to the news media and public, was mainly a history lesson for players, a majority of whom were not in the league in 1982. A union official estimated that less than 20 percent of the players who will be on NFL rosters next season were in the league five years ago.

They heard from four former union presidents — John Mackey, Tom Condon, Jeff Van Note and Ushaw himself, who took over as executive director from Ed Garvey when Garvey left in 1983 to enter politics.

"Today was really a day of getting everyone settled, of getting everyone to see what a convention is like," Ushaw said at a joint news conference with the current president, Marvin Powell, of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Ushaw reiterated what has been a standard position recently: that while free agency, guaranteed contracts and drug testing are

the attention getting issues, they are all secondary in his words to the "horizontal, not vertical."

"He also reiterated that while he has far better relations than Garvey had with the NFL's chief negotiator Jack Donlan, that doesn't mean the negotiations will be totally smooth.

"Management will test us to see how much we can take," he said.

Powell acknowledged that the present statements from both sides are basically for public consumption and predicted the major progress will probably take place in the weeks and days before the contract expires Aug. 31.

"As you get close to the expiration date of the collective bargaining agreement you'll get good, fast bargaining," he said. "It's not calling them (the owners) liars. They're good businessmen and they wouldn't be in the position they are at the head of great sports enterprises if they weren't."

# Bullets hang fifth road loss on Celtics

Boston's four-game winning streak ended and extended to five its losing losing streak.

The Celtics got no closer than five points until Danny Ainge made a 3-point shot to trim the lead to 100-97 with 40 seconds left in the game.

**Hawks 120, Mavericks 112**

The victory was the fourth straight and 15th in 16 games for Atlanta, the leader in the Central Division. The loss snapped a six-

game winning streak for Midwest-leading Dallas.

Dallas led 58-57 at halftime, but the Hawks scored the first eight points of the second half to take the lead.

The Mavericks never came closer than six after that — at 112-106 on two Mark Aguirre free throws with 2:44 remaining.

Randy Wittman scored 24 points for the Hawks, and Spud Webb and Jon Koncak had 12 apiece.

The lead changed hands nine times in the first half, with the biggest edge for Dallas seven points at 54-47 and Atlanta five points at 20-15.

**Nets 109, Blazers 104**

# Trump pays \$5 million to promote bout

NEW YORK (AP) — Entrepreneur Donald Trump paid \$5 million for the right to host a Michael Spinks-Gerry Cooney heavyweight championship fight June 15 at Atlantic City, N.J., promoter Butch Lewis said Thursday night.

Lewis said the scheduled 15-round bout will be held at the 18,000-seat Convention Center, which is connected to the Trump Hotel and Casino.

Spinks is guaranteed \$7 million and Cooney \$5 million for the bout, billed as the heavy-weight championship of the world. Although it will not be sanctioned by the International Box-

ing Federation, World Boxing Council or World Boxing Association.

Lewis said Spinks and Cooney are guaranteed against a percentage of the gross. The promoter said the fight will be shown on closed-circuit and pay television and it should have a minimum of \$25 to \$30-million gross, but could reach the neighborhood of \$50 million.

Spinks was stripped of title recognition by the IBF for refusing to agree to a mandatory defense against top-ranked Tony Tucker.

The New Jersey Athletic Control Board has agreed for the fight to be 15 rounds, and it will supervise the match, Lewis said.

Lewis said the bidding for the fight went back and forth between Trump and Caesar's Palace at Las Vegas, Nev.

Then on Wednesday, Mark Evgen, executive vice president of the Trump organization, told Lewis, "Here's our final offer. Take it or leave it," the promoter said. "The offer was \$5 million and I took it."

Lewis said both fighters will train in Atlantic City beginning 30 days before the fight. One will train at Trump Plaza and the other a Trump Castle.

The only sanctioned heavyweight champion at this time is Mike Tyson, who is recognized both by the WBC and WBA.

Tucker will fight second-ranker James "Buster" Douglas for the vacant IBF title. That fight probably will take place May 30 at the Las Vegas Hilton in Las Vegas. Ties of the WBC and WBA championships against Pinklon Thomas.

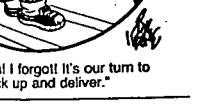

## THE ACES ON BRIDGE

BOBBY WOLFF

How should South play today's heart suit? A lucky guess is one way. A more-educated guess is available if South first plays diamonds.

South wins the club ace in dummy and draws trumps in three rounds. With two unavoidable diamond losers, how does South best avoid two heart losers?

If South plays hearts immediately, he is likely to lead a low heart to dummy's jack and East's queen. The defenders then get two hearts and two diamonds for down-one.

Of course, if South guesses right in hearts (a 50-50 shot), he goes up with dummy's king on the first heart lead and the game makes.

To increase his chances of going right in hearts, South should play diamonds. When he discovers that East has both top honors in diamonds, he is in a much better position to guess right in hearts. Given East's singleton spade, had East held the heart ace as well as the top diamond honors, he might well have found a bid over North's one diamond.

### 'Platoon' leads the pack in a quirky 59th competition

### Industry 'orphan' movies outpace studio contenders

LOS ANGELES — A star who has been nominated six times without winning the Oscar.

An actor and an actress nominated for their first film roles.

A writer-director who spent 10 years trying to make his movie about the Vietnam War.

These are the main elements that make the 59th competition for the Academy Awards among the most interesting in recent years. The winners will be announced Monday night at the Los Angeles Music Center, and most people expect it will be an evening of "Platoon."

Oliver Stone, the writer-director who made a crusade of bringing his vision of the Vietnam War to the screen, won the Directors-Guild award earlier this month, adding to other honors. His "Platoon" is likely to repeat at the Oscars, despite the admiration for Woody Allen's "Hannah and Her Sisters."

Curiously, "Platoon" can collect no Oscars for leading performances. Both Tom Berenger and Willem Dafoe, although they shared top billing with Charles Sheen, were nominated for supporting actor.

The race for "best performance by an actor in a leading role" offers a wide range. Dexter Gordon, the burned-out jazz star of "Round Midnight," had never acted before. As the veteran hustler Fast Eddie Felson in "The Color of Money," Paul Newman won his seventh nomination in a film career that dates back to 1955.

William Hurt, last year's winner for "Kiss of the Spider Woman," is again in contention for "Children of a Lesser God." First-time nominees are Bob Hoskins ("Mona Lisa") and James Woods ("Salvador").

Two former winners are among the best-actress nominees: Jane Fonda, "The Morning After," and Sissy Spacek, "Crimes of the Heart." The others are first-time nominees: Mariel Matlin, "Children of a Lesser God"; Kathleen Turner, "Peggy Sue Got Married"; and Sigourney Weaver, "Aliens."

Miss Matlin, whose hearing is impaired, had never made a film before. A victory could make her the fourth best actress Oscar in a first performance.

The ceremonies begin at 7 p.m. Monday, with ABC again carrying the telecast. Gone are the days of Bob Hope and Johnny Carson, when a single funnyman nudged the proceedings along. This year four "participants"—Chevy Chase, Goldie Hawn, Robin Williams and Michael Caine—will take turns on the podium.

For the first time since 1965, all of the winning winners from last year will repeat at the Oscars, including William Hurt, Geraldine Page, Don Ameche, Anjelica Huston—will be on-hand to present this year's awards.

The producer of the 59th Academy Awards has a famous name: Samuel Goldwyn Jr. The son of a legendary filmmaker and himself head of a thriving company, Goldwyn is especially pleased to have an opportunity to pay tribute to Irving Thalberg, who was head of production at Universal Studio at age 20 and later built the star factory of MGM. He died in 1936 at the age of 37.

"It has never been done before at the awards, and many people are not aware of who he is," Goldwyn says. "It's especially significant because the Thalberg award is being given to another young man who is carrying on the tradition of fine filmmaking." The Thalberg award for "consistently high quality of motion picture production" is being presented to Steven Spielberg, 39, who is expected to fly here from post-production work in London on "Empire of the Sun."

Explaining his philosophy about the Oscar show, Goldwyn says, "I wanted to let everybody express what movies mean to them. This is a chance for a lot of us to say, 'We know how hard it is to make movies, here is your reward.' It's a simple message that doesn't have to be made in a ponderous way."

As producer, Goldwyn faced the ever-present challenge of keeping the show from bogging down into a meaningless effusion of speechmaking and thanks. "I reviewed the shows for the past 20 years and I discovered that the great moments happened in the first 30 seconds of speeches," Goldwyn says. See OSCARS on Page D2

nominated for best picture this year.

There are other orphan nominees this year: "Platoon," which Oliver Stone tried to make for 10 years; "Children of a Lesser God," which required six years to get filmed; and "A Room With a View," which was turned down by all the major studios.

Only Woody Allen's "Hannah and Her Sisters," which recast seven nominations—might be called a father-and-son role into one mainstream film, although Allen's contract with Orion Pictures makes him as independent as a filmmaker can get.

"Crimes of the Heart," with three nominations, was rejected by two studios before it was made; "Salvador" has two nominations and the producers had to release it themselves; "Mona Lisa" with a nomination for best actor for Bob Hoskins, was filmed on a shoestring in England.

"Platoon" was rejected by every major studio until the British-based Hemdale Films agreed to provide the \$6 million budget. Hemdale had put up \$2 million for Oliver Stone to film another project, "Salvador," which dealt with political misdeeds in El Salvador.

"It was something that Oliver wanted to do, and we went for it," said John Daly, president of Hemdale. "But when we tried to interest major distributors in 'Salvador,' they all said the subject was too hot. Despite our relationship with Orion (which later released 'Platoon'), they also passed, because of the failure of 'Under Fire.' It had a similar theme, but not the same reality. So we were forced to distribute 'Salvador' ourselves."

Daly said theater grosses for "Salvador" have been modest—under \$4 million. However, videocassette sales are strong. "Salvador" also is being rereleased in theaters on the strength of the Oscar nominations and the hit of "Platoon."

Producers Lamm Merchant said he tried to interest every major studio and two independents in "A Room With a View." The usual reply he received was: "It's not the kind of film we're interested in."

"One of them" said the studio would consider it if he combined the nominations—might be called a father-and-son role into one mainstream film, although Allen's contract with Orion Pictures makes him as independent as a filmmaker can get.

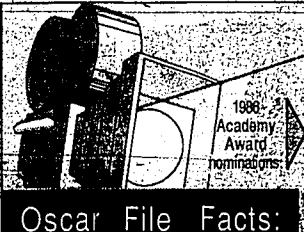

Putnam also recalled his frustration in trying to find backing for "Charlots of Fire." At one point, he said, he was willing to make it a TV movie of the week. Finally 20th Century Fox agreed to provide half the financing and then declined the U.S. release rights.

Burt Sugarman, producer of TV's rock show, "Midnight Special," reasoned he could make his entry into films by snapping up hit Broadway plays. It wasn't that easy. See ORPHANS on Page D2



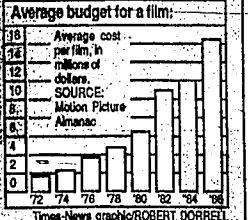
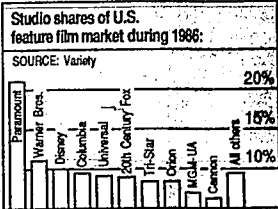

### Fine performances save some ordinary vehicles

HOLLYWOOD — No fair movie was ever made great through an assemblage of mediocre performances. On the other hand, many otherwise forgettable vehicles have been distinguished by the actor or actress who has found a memorable way to make us feel a little less lonely in the dark.

This year's Academy Awards crop is a sterling example. Of the nine movies that boast Oscar nominees

for best actor or actress (one film has two), only three — four at best — represent a serious or penetrating view of human experience. The rest are either genre pieces or premise movies that fizzle. All but one of the mediocre movies ("The Morning After") can still be seen in a neighborhood theater somewhere.

The following is no special order except for that of saving the best for last, is a critical rundown of these actors in their roles, or to put it another way, an assessment of the

**Will a deaf new comer, 21, trounce four stars in prime of their careers?**

LOS ANGELES — Four stars in the prime of their careers and one 21-year-old newcomer who cannot speak are the candidates who make the 59th Academy Award race for best actress the most arresting in recent years.

Jane Fonda, Oscar winner for "Kluge" in 1971 and "Coming Home" in 1978, was nominated for her performance as the boozing ex-actress caught in a murder plot in "The Morning After." It is her seventh nomination.

Sissy Spacek, who won the best actress prize for her portrayal of country star Loretta Lynn in the 1980 "Coal Miner's Daughter," was cited this year for her role as the dippy, shaming sister in "Crimes of the Heart."

Kathleen Turner, who rose to stardom after her first film, "Body Heat," was nominated for her role as the housewife who relives her teen years in "Peggy Sue Got Married."

Sigourney Weaver, a dramatic actress ("The Year of Living Dangerously"), was nominated for her Rambo-like space-adventurer in "Aliens."

Marlee Matlin, deaf from the age of 18 months, won her nomination for portraying the wordless cleaning woman who learns to conquer her fury in "Children of a Lesser God."

It is Miss Matlin who has captured the media's most attention. At a recent luncheon for the nominees, she impressed interviewers with her sprightly, rapid-fire answers delivered by signing and relayed by an interpreter. Asked if she expected to find other film roles, she replied: "That depends on how imaginative producers are."

Did she expect to be the sentimental favorite at this year's awards? "I expect to have a good night at the Oscars," she said. "I tend to be courageous. I've been that way all my life. I go for what I want, and I speak what I feel."

Some might argue that sentiment affords her an unfair advantage against the four other candidates, that she must have found it easy to play a deaf woman.

However, she said making "Children of a Lesser God" was "a lot of physical and emotional, good and bad times." Out of the film came her real-life romance with co-star William Hurt; they continue to share a New York apartment.

For her role as the alcoholic actress in "The Morning After," Miss Fonda researched with her customary thoroughness.

"A few times I got very drunk, that she must be the bathroom and say, 'Now I'm going to study myself.' I didn't learn anything, so I put that aside," she said. "I went to talk to doctors, sober alcoholics, went to a number of A.A. (Alcoholics Anonymous) meetings. Her best coaching came from an alcoholic actress who told her to 'feel insecure unless I'm out of control. Drink to me means the loss of control, and that's how I feel secure.'"

Miss Spacek's feat in "Crimes of the Heart" was extraordinary: outshining two other Oscar winners, Jessica Lange and Diane Keaton. It could be argued that she had the showier role: She shoots her husband in the stomach and has an affair with a teen-ager.

Miss Spacek was also nominated for "Cries of the Heart" (1976), "Missing" (1982) and "The River" (1984). "I've always tended to play very strong women, and they rubbed off on me and made me stronger. Now I suppose I feel strong enough to play troubled women," she said.

But roles such as the quirky Babe McGrath Botrelle of "Crimes of the Heart" apparently don't rub off on her. "People perceive me as a happy-go-lucky, stable person, and it's perfectly true. Maybe I can be that way I am in real life because I get paid to freak out."

Kathleen Turner won her first Academy nomination for "Peggy Sue Got Married." However, in six years she has acquired enough lustre to be dubbed "The New Queen of the Screen" by People magazine. She made it with a series of stunning and varied portraits in "Body Heat," "The Man With Two Brains," "Romancing the Stone," "Crimes of Passion" and last year's "Prizzi's Honor."

As Peggy Sue she had an actress' dream: playing a middle-age housewife in the present as well as a high schooler in a flashback dream.

At the nominees' luncheon, she didn't learn about criticism that she didn't look like a teen-ager, she replied, "Peggy Sue didn't try to pass as 18; she was always 42 in her mind."

Sigourney Weaver may be the first actress to win an Oscar nomination in the kind of role usually reserved for such performers as Sylvester Stallone and Arnold Schwarzenegger. Her nomination came from a repeat of the role of Warrant Officer Ripley that she played in her film debut, "Alien," in 1979.

She has learned the role "Ramolina." But her inspiration came from more bookish sources: "I really structured myself to play Ripley like Henry V and like the women warriors in classic Chinese literature."

Miss Weaver wins the Oscar next Monday, she will achieve a new record: the first time a woman has won for repeating a role.

LOS ANGELES — This year's Academy Award race for best actor offers one of the most spirited and diverse encounters in recent times. The contenders are an aging jazzman, a feisty cockney, last year's reclusive winner, a movie icon and a dark horse from a film few people saw.

The renowned saxophonist Dexter Gordon is the first musician ever nominated in the actor category for his portrayal of a burnt-out jazzman in "Round Midnight."

British actor Bob Hoskins is nominated for his role in "Mona Lisa." Last year's winner, William Hurt, is up for "Children of a Lesser God." Paul Newman is nominated for "The Color of Money," repeating the role he played in the 1961 "The Hustler" as Fast Eddie Felson.

The dark horse is James Woods, who stars in "Salvador." On the morning the nominations were announced, he decided to sleep through "There was something about turning on the television at 5:30 and hearing you weren't nominated" speech on the radio would really be depressing," he said.

Woods' sleep was interrupted by telephones ringing, so he turned off his answering machine and heard the news. At first he feared the good tidings might be a prank. Then he turned on his television and heard a replay of the announcement.

Woods recalled his reaction: "You always wonder as an actor, 'What would it be like to be nominated for an Oscar?' No matter how cynical you are, you're always rehearsing your acceptance speech on the way to every audition. When it happened, I was so touched and so proud."

He was admittedly the long shot in the nominations, since "Salvador"

had only a limited release. But he felt two factors were in his favor: Those who had seen the movie had been profoundly affected by it and the success of Oliver Stone's other film, "Platoon," helped call attention to it.

This is Newman's seventh nomination as an actor. He also was nominated for producing "Rachel, Rachel." If he wins the Oscar on Monday, he will baffle his own prediction that he would finally receive the award at age 83: "They'll carry me out on a stretcher, and I'll reach out my wizened arm from the coverlet and grab it."

In a recent Los Angeles Times interview, Newman jokingly compared his long quest for the Oscar with evangelist Oral Roberts' recent plea for millions. "Oral Roberts has said if he doesn't raise that money by the end of March, God is going to call him home. Then whatever will be done to me?"

It is a matter of record, not sour grapes, that Newman has never liked the idea of competing for acting honors. "I can understand how you can be competitive about automobile racing, because you have to get from one point to another," he said. "The first one there is the winner. But I don't know how you can be competitive about acting. There's nothing clean to it."

At 64, Gordon finds himself an Oscar nominee in his first major acting performance. His weathered face tells a history of jazz, which he has played all his life. He was a leading figure in developing bebop and a contemporary of jazz greats Charlie Parker and Lester Young. "Our personal lives were pretty chaotic, we weren't the most stable people in the world," he said.

Gordon started recording with his own band on the Savoy label in 1945, and he has been playing ever since,

with occasional intermissions for personal upheavals.

Along with Woods and Gordon, Hoskins also is a first-time nominee. Like the hoodlum, he plays in "Mona Lisa"; he is an unimpeachable cockney, though he has played "Othello" and other classics on the English stage and television.

As a young man Hoskins tried everything from window-washing to accounting. One night in a pub friends mentioned he was trying out for a play. Hoskins went along and found his life's profession.

Americans know him from his portrayal of gangster *Omney Madden* in "The Cotton Club" and his portrayal of the Italian dictator in TV's "Mussolini."

Hurt has been a star since his first film, "Altered States," in 1980. Hurt remains an enigmatic figure. Rarely interviewed, he once said, "I'm a character actor in a leading man's body."

In "Children of a Lesser God," Hurt plays a teacher at a school for the deaf who tries to tame an embittered former student. A romance ensues, as it did in real life between the actor and his co-star, Marlee Matlin.

He received the best actor Oscar last year for his moving portrayal of an imprisoned homosexual in "Wisdom of the Spider Woman." If he wins this year, he'll join a select group of actors with back-to-back Oscars: Luise Rainer, Spencer Tracy, Katharine Hepburn and Jason Robards.

hand we have been dealt this year.

Sir Laurence Olivier once defined metaphysics as the cushion by which an actor protects himself from self-consciousness, and cautioned that over a period of time an accumulation of 25 or 30 of them will seriously box an actor in. A paradox of Paul Newman's career is that, with a few luminous moments excepted, he has been as the schoolyard scene in "The Verdict," when his desperate character looked as though he would genuinely lose his mind if he did not get an answer (he needed), Newman has retained one of our most appealing stars long after becoming one of our most mannered actors.

While it is true that great artists can also be unconscionable thieves, Newman has been borrowing from himself for so long now that he is operating under the law of diminishing returns. Though he appears suspiciously distinguished-looking as Eddie Felson redux in "The Color of Money" (Eddie's lifelong curse is that his big-time talent is at odds with a small-time charity party), the early portion of the movie is sustained by Newman's exuberant, stylish confidence (and an old acting pro's lessons in the art for the young comer, Tom Cruise).

But he eventually runs out of tricks to animate Eddie. By the

time he has his emotional breakdown scene in front of Cruise and Mary Elizabeth Mastrantonio, the sobbing and gesturing appears so calculated that one cannot tell whether he is using them or hustling us with old personalized Newman shtick. As his performance unfolds, the last half of the movie seems largely an appreciation of how great he looks in eyeglasses. That at least is what we are left with — most notable absent of one of the most engaging faces in the history of movies. But when Newman ends with the line "I'm back," the Fast Eddie shuffle has played itself out so long ago that one wonders, "Back where?"

The mystery of Sissy Spacek's nomination for best actress in "Crimes of the Heart" is how anyone could single out a performance that has been so keenly tuned into an ensemble effort that it cannot be yanked out. Beth Henley's Pulitzer Prize-winning play has less comic vitality and whacked-out charm in its movie form, but it also has more psychological shading — at least in the performances of Henley's ensemble cast. Three Sisters, Jessica Lange's Meg is the pretty, tart one; Diane Keaton is the filmy splinter, Lenny; Spacek's Babe is the one in the middle who seems to regard them with a kind of mystified

wonder at how the familial gene could be so radically split.

The appeal of Spacek's performance is in its artful deference. The camera catches her looking at her sisters as though the self-contained definition of the faces and forms and personalities is not a redemptive clue to the mystery of her own life, in which cause and effect are partially unbinged. Flashbacks are just as real to Babe as present action, and Spacek wraps every moment in the gauze of a dream-world normality. She shoots her husband without rancor and drinks lemonade afterward without guilt. Spacek uses a small, winsome, catlike smile to describe a character who has been mysterious by number: But this is not a role that requires a great deal of range; the pleasure of this movie is in sneaking a look at the dynamics of three women alone together — to which Keaton and Lange contribute every bit as much as Spacek.

Vietnam has been termed America's first rock 'n' roll war, but no post-Vietnam acting performance in the movies integrated the spoked, jumpy rhythms of war-torn nerves until James Woods appeared as the Gonzo photographer Richard Boyle in "Salvador."

The jagged edges in Woods' scrambling performance form the cinematic equivalent of Michael Herr's book on Vietnam, "Dispatches," and are a reminder that while the open conflicts in El Salvador and Nicaragua are not exact replicas of Vietnam, there are plenty of parallels in the juxtaposition of the horrible and the everyday, of banality and the shocking anarchy of blood.

Woods' character is a contemporary equivalent of the civilian war junkie whose nose twitches for the smell of cordite; that is where the action is, and he will do anything to get a piece of it and sell it for a

photographic souvenir to a news editor. Underneath like the movie itself, the performance never settles. Woods' Boyle is almost always on the hustle for money and equipment (this is not a character who questions anything — there is no innocence in him, to say we see in a confessional scene where a priest casually absolves his sins, after which Woods, for once taken aback, says: "If I'd known this I'd have come sooner" (this scene is reported to have been improvised).

What would "Mona Lisa" be without Bob Hoskins' Director and co-writer Neil Jordan (with David Leland) certainly have an informed eye on London's demimonde and its plumps, hustlers, junkies and the heart-renderingly pathetic young hookers of Kings Cross, whose hard faces are lit as if by the fires of hell.

Michael Caine once again gives a masterful performance as a sleazy underworld king-pin — his florid face is bloated with corruption and the expression in his eyes is as flat and dead as a lizard's — and 20-year-old Cathy Tyson makes a shrewd and elegant screen debut as the call girl Simone, whom Hoskins is hired to chauffeur and protect.

But Hoskins is that rarely in film, an actor who to become a leading man through strength of character (which is different than willfulness). His twerpy gall and his diffidence at the beginning of the movie is a trick to distract us from what is underneath a character with a volcanic temperament. Physically, Hoskins is a piece; he uses his trellis body unusually well in a medium that tends to focus on the face.

The character of Georgie is not on the surface an emotionally complicated man. But Hoskins convincingly plays Georgie's transitions. Hoskins is the biggest little man on screen since Edward G. Robinson.

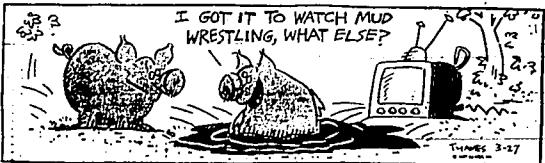

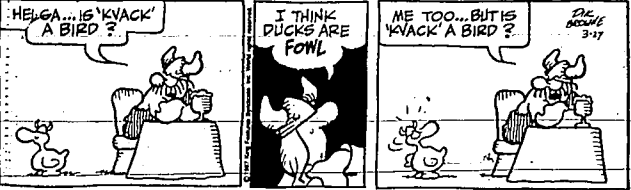

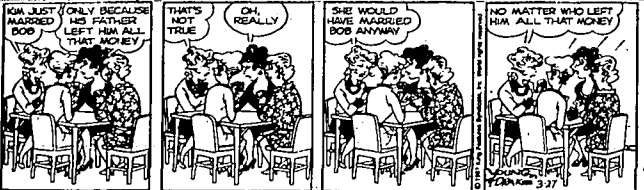

# Female allure spikes 'Black Widow'

### Movie review

**BLACK WIDOW (R).** The same story that lures us one woman's obsession with the grace and sexual skill of another — finally lets us down. The screenplay ventures into deep water — murder, sexual fixations and pro-lovesian yearnings for starters — but never really breaks the surface, and the denouement especially feels cut, or hastily slapped together. What is left are a pair of brilliant, rare performances by Theresa Russell and Debra Winger, without the bolstering of an equivalent male star.

**ANGEL HEART (R).** Occasionally Parter's sumptuous, often overwrought visual sense stands him in great stead in this deceptive story, which begins like '50s film noir and ends like an occult mystery with voodoo overtones. Mickey Rourke's scabrous gumshoe is one of his best performances, elegantly counterpointed by Robert De Niro as the mysterious gentleman who hires him to track down a '40s crooner, the missing Johnny Favorite. Lisa Bonet is sullenly fine, but the

film's earlier X rating was peculiar to say the least; other films have had sex, nudity and violence in these proportions and remained unscathed.

**HOOSIERS (PG).** This film is as engaging, as modest, as utopian American and as thrilling as the real-life story it is based on: the rise of a tiny town's high school basketball team to the Indiana state finals. It also features some of the finest acting you could hope for with a dark past. Dennis Hopper (Oscar nominee for Best Supporting Actor) as the alcoholic ex-boops-star, and Barbara Hershey as Hank's initial adversary. The film has a few bumps (some plot elements feel grafted on, and the editing rhythms are not always right) but you can hate basketball and yet still have a sensational time at "Hoosiers."

**HUNK (PG).** Nice but nerdy computer hack (Steve Levitt) helps his soul to look like a Greek god

(John Allen Nelson) writer-director Lawrence Bassoff develops his amusing premise with wit, but his film is rough around the edges, peopled by too many caricatures. Nelson is most effective, however, as heaping all the spunk of Nelson's beard, inside a handsome, muscular exterior.

**LETHAL WEAPON (R).** For the first half here — when Mel Gibson and Danny Glover are sketching to their characters — this buddy-buddy cop thriller works very well, even though stretches of "as HRS." "Magnum Force" and "Hostile" keep floating over the story like scum on a lake. It is Gibson's first big juicy mythic-hero part since Mad Max — suicidal, crazy, magnetic — and he is terrific (so is Glover as his straight man). **MANNING (PG).** A dreamy, warm-hearted jerk falls in love with a beautiful mousquetaire (reincarnated Egyptian princess) who, through courage and faith, helps him become a stellar warrior. **A NIGHTMARE ON ELM STREET 3: DREAM WARRIORS (R).** Horrible Freddy Krueger (Robert Englund) is back yet again, but by now his movies are becoming parodies of the morbid original. The result here is an ambitious horror comedy with some imaginative fantasy sequences and some hilarious lines; now you can laugh at the grisliness. Heather Langenkamp is back as intrepid Nancy Thompson, now a psychiatrist determined to help a new group of youngsters menaced in their dreams by Freddy. With Craig Wasson, John Saxon.

**PLATOON (R).** This is movie making with a zealot's fervor. Director-writer Oliver Stone, decorated Vietnam infantryman himself, clearly wants us to understand what fighting in that war was like. He succeeds with an immediacy that is frightening. War movies of the past, even the greatest ones, seem like crane shots by comparison; "Platoon" is at ground zero. And, not incidentally, Stone may have put a stake through the heart of all the slick Rambo heroes ever to slide onto a screen.

and the jarring loveliness of 25-year-old Bibi Andersson as the Devil's target. Would that all failed films were as good as Bergman's. (3 stars) — MICHAEL WILMINGTON

"Variety," Media, \$89.95. What fun this near-surreal, low-budget Manhattan movie is. Director Bette Gordon's pretty, wholesome-looking heroine (Sandy MacLeod), in need of a job, becomes a box-office cashier at a Times Square porno theater, an experience that unleashes her sexual imagination. There is a zany, intensely visual, odysseylike quality to "Variety" that recalls Jim Jarmusch's "Stranger Than Paradise" and Susan Seidelman's "Desperately Seeking Susan." Indeed, John Lurie, star of the Jarmusch film and also the composer of its score, contributed the new wave-ish music of "Variety." "Variety" (not to be confused with the classic German silent film) is actually more complex than "Stranger Than Paradise," especially in the challenge it raises to the usual feminist view toward pornography. # Lethal Weapon' collars third week in top sales

**HOLLYWOOD (AP)** — The top thriller, "Lethal Weapon," collared most viewers last weekend for the third week in a row, helping the movie industry maintain a record pace for the normally slow winter-spring season.

The Mel Gibson-Danny Glover team, named "Million" for Warner Bros., which also took second place with comedian Whoopi Goldberg's "Burglar" reaping \$4.5 million.

"Platoon" stayed strong in third with \$3.8 million for the 14th week. "Nightmare on Elm Street III" dropped from second to fourth with \$3.6 million, and the Richard Dreyfuss-Danny DeVito comedy "Tin Men" took fifth with \$3.5 million.

There was a sharp dropoff to sixth place, with "Mannequin" bringing in \$2.2 million and the rest of the top 10 also hovering around the \$2 million mark.

Those films included, in descending order: the Lisa Bonet voodoo thriller "Angel Heart," the Gene Hackman-Dennis Hopper basketball fable "Hoosiers," the Bette Midler-Shelley Long comedy "Outrageous Fortune" and the latest teen film from John Hughes, "Some Kind of Wonderful."

Nationally, this year's box office towers above the year to date for 1986, earning \$736.3 million to \$666.6 million.

million for the same period, according to Daily Variety.

The gross is running ahead of 1984, when the final tally surpassed \$4 billion for the first and only time in history. Normally, moving-tape sales in the months following the busy Christmas season until it heats up again on the Memorial Day weekend.

Art Murphy, film industry analyst for Daily Variety and the director of a management program at the University of Southern California School of Cinema, said Tuesday the reason for a box-office boom "is always the quality of the films."

Murphy, who compiled the box-office figures for Variety, said the industry runs in a five-year cycle and is currently rebounding from a downslide year.

# Younger 'Family Ties' daughter takes philosophical view of life

These days, "Family Ties" is a Grade-A hit, ensconced in the No. 2 spot of the national ratings. But it hasn't always been that way.

Cast members clearly remember the old days, when instead of forming the solid second link in NBC's blockbuster Thursday-night lineup, "Family Ties" was up against some of TV's stiffest competition — and having a hard time carving out a niche for itself.

"At the beginning, (NBC entertainment president) Brandon Tartikoff put us up against 'Dynasty,' which was like murder," recalls Tina Yothers, who plays younger daughter Jennifer Keaton on the hit show. "But we've always stuck with it and encouraged it to keep going. And we finally got through."

Yothers, for one, never doubted that the show eventually would make it. "I knew when it first started that the show was going to be a hit someday, because it dealt with a lot of subjects that needed to be dealt with," she says. "At the time, there were too many cop shows and too many shows where you couldn't sit down and laugh. Something needed to break that barrier, and we kind of did it first."

## ABC variety series to feature Parton

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Dolly Parton has signed for a one-hour show of music, comedy and dance next fall on ABC, the network said Monday.

Parton, who starred last December in her first TV movie, "A Smokey Mountain Christmas," will headline the first network attempt at a variety show in a number of years.

"There are few stars in the world who have the instant recognition and sheer likeability of Dolly Parton," said ABC Entertainment president Brandon Stoddard. "To say we are delighted that she will be part of our weekly series lineup next fall is the understatement of the season."

Stoddard said that all of Parton's appearances in specials and her TV movie resulted in high ratings.

This will be the first regular appearance on television by Parton.

There were so many such letters, in fact, that Yothers recently pulled her responses together in a book: "Being Your Best: Tina Yothers' Guide for Girls" (Pocket Books, \$2.75).

"My first ambition to write the book came about when I was reading my fan mail," she says. "A very large percentage of it was from teen-age girls asking me questions about growing up and things. So I decided to gather up all the information I could and talk to people like psychologists, teachers, parents."

Yothers is a fairly regular viewer of "Family Ties" herself. "I don't make it a religion like some people do," she says. "But whenever I have a chance, I'll watch some of it."

But Thursday nights are often Yothers' nights out. "I usually go shopping on Thursday nights, because the people who are going to recognize me are home watching the show," she explains. "Most of the actors do that — they go out when their show is on. You won't get a big crowd around you. You just get a few people who forgot that tonight was the night."

After nearly five years, one would think that even "Family Ties," the show she always believed in, would start to get a bit boring. Yothers disagrees. "It's like asking does your family get boring," she says. "I don't think anybody would ever leave the show. It's like a home. If we want to go off and do a movie or an album or a book on the side, that's OK. But we'll all come back to the same place."
