Hart calls off campaign

DENVER — Gary Hart, his front-running presidential campaign crippled by questions about his personal life, is withdrawing from the race for the 1988 Democratic nomination, a Hart campaign aide said Thursday.

"That's the word — it's pretty shocking to me. I suspect it's pretty shocking to Gary Hart," said Roger McDaniel, Hart's Wyoming campaign manager.

McDaniel confirmed the word from sources, who asked not to be identified by name, that Hart campaign manager Bill Dixon and other aides were telephoning supporters of the former senator with the stunning news that Hart would quit the race.

Hart's decision came five days after publication of a newspaper story that he had entertained a 29-year-old model overnight in his Washington townhouse. Both Hart and the woman denied the story, but Hart's standing in the polls has plummeted in the past few days.

The Washington Post reported in Friday's editions that Hart's decision came after the paper presented his staff with "documented evidence of a recent liaison between Hart and a Washington woman with whom he has had a long-term relationship."

The Post quoted a senior Hart aide as saying, "The Post's information 'accelerated' the inevitable withdrawal of Hart from the race."

Hart, who mounted a surprisingly strong bid for the 1984 presidential nomination, has been the prohibitive front-runner in the early maneuvering for 1988. His withdrawal would create a political vacuum that the remaining seven contenders would rush to fill, and might prompt other Democrats to enter the campaign as well.

Officially, Hart's campaign remained mum about his intentions, except to announce that the 50-year-old former senator would make an announcement on Friday.

Kathy Blitzer, spokeswoman for the campaign, said Hart would make an announcement at 10 a.m. MDT Friday at his home. Asked whether he would withdraw from the race Friday, Blitzer said, "We don't know that."

Hart officially announced his candidacy on April 13, and has been battling rumors about his personal life and questions about his \$1.3 million 1984 campaign debt from the start.

The crippling blow came on Sunday, when the Miami Herald reported that he had spent the night at his Washington townhouse with Miami model Donna Rice. Hart and others denied the account, and Hart attacked the newspaper.

At an extraordinary news conference in New Hampshire on Wednesday, Hart again denied having sex with Rice, but he refused to answer questions about whether he had ever committed adultery.

He had scheduled a full day of campaigning in New Hampshire for Thursday, but abruptly cancelled all the events and flew to Denver with his wife.

In a statement released earlier by Hart in Groveton, N.H., Hart said that "while running for president is important, right now my family is more important... This campaign, and the ideals and ideas it represents, will continue and our cause will succeed."

Hart came to New Hampshire on Wednesday, pursued by questions about his relationship with Rice. After campaign events and the news conference, Hart and his wife decided after midnight to fly to Denver.

Hart said nothing as he and his wife, Lee, arrived at Jefferson County Airport, northwest of Denver, Strategic Defense Initiative, as Star Wars is formally known.

Hospital at Gooding cuts services

GOODING — The emergency room will close and overnight medical stays will end at Gooding County Memorial Hospital, following a unanimous vote Thursday of the County Board of Commissioners.

Emergency room services end at Sunday midnight and acute care, or overnight hospital visits, will end June 8. Commissioners made the cutbacks, which include laying off 22 of the hospital's 32 employees, to decrease operating losses and keep the facility open in some form.

Officials said the move to keep only same-day surgeries, X-ray, lab work and an acute-care clinic open during "normal business hours" nearly closes the hospital as the community knows it. But by maintaining some medical services, commissioners hope to fulfill requirements of a government grant threatening to cut off county health care services if the hospital is closed completely.

Commission Chairman Bob Thackeray made a brief statement to the 25 assembled community members, including hospital employees and physicians, before the vote. He noted that the hospital's decision occurred intensively during the past 60- to 90 days and that changes in hospital services had been anticipated for two years before that.

Reasons for cutting back services include consistent operating losses and mounting debt while Gooding County residents failed to adequately support the hospital by using its services, Thackeray said.

"The level of support we received was not enough to carry the expense of the hospital," he said.

Commissioner Rod Hohnhorst said the current year, the county would lose \$70,000 by December 1990 if it continues to offer all services. That is compared to owing the federal government about \$480,000 for closing the hospital now, because of a Hill-Burton grant requiring the hospital remain open until 1990, he said.

Hospital officials estimate GCMH operating losses will continue under the proposed cutbacks. But the losses are expected to be significantly less than the \$22,000-a-month rate the hospital suffered in March.

Hospital doctors said they expected little change in their practices.

Chief of Staff Mary Ann McAfee said she is interested in pursuing more same-day surgeries. She

Doctors, other hospitals will handle emergencies

GOODING — Starting Monday, Gooding residents with a medical emergency will not be treated at the Gooding County Memorial Hospital.

Local officials say patients should go directly to their doctor's office, to St. Benedict's Family Medical Center in Jerome or Magic Valley Regional Medical Center in Twin Falls.

Gooding County Ambulance Service will still provide emergency medical transportation, but to those hospitals rather than to GCMH. That ambulance service is dispatched by the sheriff's office at 934-4421.

GCMH emergency services and overnight stays were eliminated Thursday by the County Board of Commissioners to limit ongoing hospital operating losses.

Commission Chairman Bob Thackeray announced the cutbacks in hospital services during a brief meeting attended by 25 community members. When asked by a resident whether eliminating the emergency room meant turning away someone suffering from a heart attack, Thackeray said, "Exactly."

It is because of the serious nature of the decision that county officials are scrambling to get out word of the change.

County Clerk John Myers is preparing public notices explaining the elimination of emergency room services and what number to call for medical emergencies. The County Board of Commissioners hopes the notices and media attention will work to notify residents of the change.

But some private citizens and officials worry about the lack of

Senators approve oil limit

WASHINGTON — The Senate Finance Committee approved an omnibus trade bill on a 19-1 vote Thursday after including a provision to restrict oil imports if they show signs of exceeding half of U.S. production.

The measure won approval despite reservations from Republicans who have played major roles in the debate over the nation's \$16.3 billion trade deficit and the remedies Congress has been weighing since early 1985.

"This bill is still salvageable," Sen. Bob Packwood, R-Ore., said before the measure was adopted. But he expressed concern over provisions to impose a quota on lamb imports and narrow the president's leeway to reject import restraints to help industries threatened by foreign competition.

Packwood said that if the bill were the finished product of a House-Senate conference committee, he would not vote to send it to the president's desk.

The oil provision, sponsored by Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, D-Texas, chairman of the Finance Committee, was aimed at restricting imports to 50 percent or less of the annual supply. It was approved 10-7 after Bentsen said it was needed to prevent the armed forces from becoming overly dependent on imports.

Dependence on foreign oil totaled 27 percent in 1985 but now is estimated to be around 40 percent, Bentsen said. Critics countered that the measure would give too much power to the president and might not represent the best way to meet defense needs.

House votes carrier funding

WASHINGTON — The House voted Thursday to approve two more aircraft carriers for the Navy, casting turning down attempts to torpedo the giant warships as too expensive.

The decisions came as the Democratic-controlled chamber worked its way through a bill authorizing \$28 billion in Pentagon spending for the fiscal year that begins Oct. 1.

The House had been scheduled to debate the "Star Wars" missile defense system Thursday amid a prediction by House Speaker Jim Wright, D-Texas, that the program's budget would be frozen, but the chamber abruptly delayed a decision on the issue.

Majority Leader Tom Foley, D-Wash., said the Star Wars decision was pushed back to next week because the debate was likely to be lengthy and take most of a full day. Debate on the bill has been slower than expected and the House is likely to spend most of the rest of May on it, Foley told his colleagues.

The bill includes a \$660-million down payment on a pair of aircraft carriers that will eventually cost a total of \$5.9 billion when they are built in the next decade.

The nuclear-powered giants, the world's largest warships, will replace a pair of World War II-era carriers and will keep the Navy's total of carriers at 15.

The House first rejected, 284-124, an amendment by Rep. Lynn Martin, R-Ill., to strike all carrier money from the bill.

Then it rebuffed, 267-145, a move by Rep. Dave McCurdy, D-Okla., to knock out funds for one of the warships.

Ms. Martin argued that the carriers shouldn't be purchased now, particularly in a time of high federal deficits. But "we all know what's happening here," she said, referring to the Navy's successful lobbying effort to keep the ships in the bill.

One of the strongest proponents of the ships was Rep. Herb Bateman, R-Nevada, whose district in Newport News, Va., is a shipyard where all of the supercarriers are built.

Profiteering questions turn Secord combative

WASHINGTON — The Iran-Contra hearings turned combative Thursday with leadoff witness Richard V. Secord snapping, "I didn't come here voluntarily to be badgered," as he was peppered with questions about profiteering and violating a congressional ban on military aid to Nicaraguan rebels.

The nationally televised Senate inquiry, in its third day, was transformed from a relaxed proceeding to a confrontational session as first Senate chief counsel Arthur Liman and then committee members pressed Secord repeatedly on his financial interest in the deals. Secord insisted he did not profit.

He also faced sharp questions about whether he felt it was appropriate for a private citizen to carry out foreign policy activities. And one senator said Secord's testimony made it likely he will eventually be indicted.

Secord also echoed statements he made Wednesday about White House involvement, saying "It was my belief that the president of the United States was well aware of what we were doing."

However, President Reagan reiterated that he was unaware of

any covert airlift of arms to Nicaraguan rebels.

Secord testified on Wednesday that "fixed" House national security aide Lt. Col. Oliver North told him the president knew of the diversion of Iran arms sales money for that purpose.

"Then he was misinformed," Reagan said.

"I did not know about it and I did not know, and I am still waiting to know where did that money go," the president said in response to questions from reporters during a White House ceremony.

Reagan said he knew that Secord, as a private citizen, was engaged with other private citizens in trying to get aid to the Contras.

But Reagan said there was nothing illegal in that, and he added, concerning citizens who wanted to make such efforts, "I'm very pleased that American people felt that way."

Under questioning on Capitol Hill, Secord said Thursday he was skeptical about the truth of a North comment he had quoted on Wednesday to the effect that North had told Reagan it was ironic that Iranian money was going to the Contras.

While saying he had no way of knowing whether North had really

made that remark to Reagan, Secord said, "It doesn't sound like the kind of story one would hear in the office of the commander-in-chief."

Secord said Thursday that North once joked that if the secret Contra supply activities were revealed, he — North — would be pardoned.

"I laughed at him (North) and I said, 'That's ridiculous. What are you talking about?' No laws are being broken. We're doing everything we can to live within the law," Secord said.

But Sen. David L. Boren, D-Okla., chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee, pointedly asked Secord about private citizens carrying out foreign policy activities, especially seeking contacts with Iranian officials.

Secord replied, "I must tell you, sir, that I was doing the best I could under the circumstances. And I thought I was carrying out the president's policy."

Boren then asked Secord if he believed in the Constitution.

Secord, his face crimson, said, "Of course. I've sworn to uphold it and I've fought for it quite a few times."

"Did you not have even a moment of humility about your judgment in substituting yourself for the con-

For president, it was a time of comic relief from travail

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan got some comic relief Thursday from the travail of Iran-Contra problems, poking fun at editorial cartoonists who've had a field day lampooning him.

"Since you're so free at critiquing the job I'm doing, I thought it would only be fair, now that I have a chance, to take a shot at critiquing your work," Reagan told several dozen cartoonists. "I know you can dish it out, but can you really take it?"

Standing before members of the American Association of Editorial Cartoonists gathered in the White House Rose Garden, the president gave his unsolicited analysis of several drawings duplicated on large posters.

Before proceeding, he deadpanned, "Since we're interested in promoting family values, I'll use language other than what you're accustomed to hearing from your editors."

One poster had a full-length, frontal drawing of Reagan, quoting him as saying, "Let me clarify the last clarification of the previous clarification of the earlier clarification of the SS tax issue."

The cartoon, as do most of the Reagan caricatures — exaggerated the wavy in Reagan's well-groomed hair. Noting that, the president complained to his audience that "I've tried every way I can to make my hair stand up that way, but it just won't take."

Another cartoon had a grateful Reagan, pictured in a White House, falling apart, welcoming one cartoonist Howard H. Baker Jr., his chief of staff.

"I look a little upset in the drawing because I just found out Howard doesn't do windows in the president's office."

When he came to another exhibit, Reagan poked fun both at himself and his audience.

This one had the president in a drawing about "The Great Communicator," standing with a look of bewilderment under an empty cloud.

Reagan walked over to the poster with a liquid pencil, and started to fill in the balloon-shaped spot for a presidential quote. He inscribed the word "The" and paused, turned around and said, "I forgot what I was going to write."

"You keep us here in Washington from taking ourselves too seriously," Reagan told the cartoonists. "I can't think of any greater service to national sanity than that."

"Here at the White House during my presidency, we've taken notice of your work," he said. "In fact since my first days in office, our news summary office has produced a weekly anthology of editorial cartoons. It's called the Friday Follies. For me, and probably most of the White House staff, it's the most eagerly awaited document of the week and gives new meaning to T.G.I.F."

"So this is why I've asked you here today... to say thanks for the laughs and thanks for the groans and thanks for the insights," he said.

Finally, the visit came on the same day that — December — cartoonist Garry Trudeau had raised the ire of some in the executive mansion with a comic strip giving the White House switchboard number and urging youngsters to call for tips about safe sex.

Presidential spokesman Martin Fitzwater told reporters that White House telephone operators "have had some calls" as a result of the strip and "I've been giving them an alternate number."

The number was 212-582-0650 — the number of the New York office of Universal Press, the syndicate that distributes "Doonesbury."

FAA head sees service cuts

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. airline service, already the target of complaints by passengers and Congress over delays and safety incidents, would have to be restricted if the no-growth budget the Senate approved for the Federal Aviation Administration is enacted, the agency's chief said Thursday.

"I haven't been able to figure out how we can operate," FAA Administrator Donald D. Engen told the Senate transportation appropriations subcommittee. "We will have a serious disruption to air travel in 1988 with that budget level."

Engen did not specify what type of restrictions might be necessary. But an FAA official who asked to not be identified said they could include a limit on the number of flights allowed.

"It could happen in a number of ways," the official said. "You put a cap on the number of aircraft you would allow in the system. It's a last resort and you have to do that, but he (Engen) is going to maintain a safe system."

The Senate approved a \$1 trillion federal budget early Thursday for the 1988 fiscal year, which begins Oct. 1, that would restrict the FAA to about the \$2.8 billion it received this year for its operations.

The FAA's functions include operating the nation's air traffic control system and enforcing safety standards for planes and at airports.

Engen has been fighting for an increase in his agency's money and sought a \$3.2 billion operating budget for next year.

"If Congress denies us funds we need to operate, our hands will be tied," Engen said after the meeting.

He added that the restrictions would affect "all traffic — not just commercial traffic," which includes airlines.

Sen. Alfonso D'Amato, R-N.Y., a member of the subcommittee, said that with increasing numbers of air travel delays and hazardous incidents, the FAA needs extra money.

"We have to see that our first priority is that safety is maintained," he said.

Sen. Frank Lautenberg, D-N.J., chairman of the panel, has chided the agency for not doing a good enough job of watching the nation's skies.

Vets charge harassment by subpoena

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government is trying to harass the Vietnam Veterans of America by issuing a subpoena demanding virtually all its communications with Congress, clients and reporters, officials of the group said Thursday.

"This is a clear attempt to shut down the organization," VVA spokesman Michael Leaveck said. "They're out to not only harass us but to try to tie us down so that we can't do the things we've been doing in calling attention to some real abuses of power."

Officials of both the Veterans Administration and Justice Department would not comment on the subpoena or allegations made by the 85,000-member group.

The subpoena served Wednesday seeks documents to help defend the VA in a lawsuit filed in federal court at San Francisco by the National Association of Radiation Survivors.

NARS, a group of veterans who say they developed cancer and other serious illnesses because of exposure to atomic testing, is challenging the constitutionality of a 125-year-old law that prohibits lawyers from charging more than \$10 to handle veterans' cases at VA hearings.

Because the Vietnam Veterans of America is not a party to the lawsuit and does not handle benefit claims for radiation exposure, Leaveck contended the government agency is using the subpoena to limit the activities of one of its most strident critics.

Ortega target of accused plotters

TULSA, Okla. (AP) — Two Oklahoma men conspired to assassinate Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega, claiming an uncredited backer had put up \$5 million to finance a paramilitary mission to Central America, federal authorities said in an indictment unsealed Thursday.

The indictment said one of the men contacted the office of Rep. Phillip Crane, R-Ill., for information about traveling with arms to Honduras, which borders Nicaragua and for names of contacts there.

Crane and U.S. Attorney Layne Phillips both said the congressman was not aware of the purpose of the inquiries and had cooperated with an FBI investigation.

The indictment alleged that Donnell Howard, 35, of Maysville, and John Norris, 30, of Purcell, conspired between Dec. 1 and Jan. 29 to kill Ortega.

Howard was arrested Thursday in Oakland, Calif., said FBI spokesman Dan Vogel in Oklahoma City. Vogel said he had no immediate details of the arrest.

Norris, also arrested Thursday, appeared before a U.S. magistrate in Oklahoma City on Thursday and

a hearing was set for Friday.

There was no indication that the defendants were members of any organization or that they actually had the financial backing they allegedly described, Phillips said.

"The indictment in this case, in essence, alleges a plan by two individuals, who arguably can be characterized as vigilantes, to take the law in their own hands," Phillips said outside the Tulsa federal courthouse.

Crane said in an interview in Washington that Norris gave the impression of having "seen too many Rambo movies," adding that he "struck me as a kid fantasizing" and that he "didn't sound responsible."

Howard has a record of arrests for public drunkenness and marijuana possession, said Maysville Police Chief Dennis Purkhiser.

The defendants allegedly planned a reconnaissance mission to Honduras and made other arrangements to carry out the plot, but they did not go to Central America, according to the indictment.

Congressman dies of AIDS effects

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Stewart B. McKinney, 56, a nine-term Republican congressman from Connecticut, died Thursday from a bacterial infection brought on by AIDS, his office said.

The office issued a statement quoting McKinney's personal physician, Dr. Cesar Caceres, as saying the congressman probably contracted the disease from many blood transfusions he received while undergoing heart-bypass surgery in 1979.

The statement said: "Stewart McKinney died of pneumocystis pneumonia, a bacterial infection brought on by acquired immune deficiency syndrome."

The Centers for Disease Control says that among adult AIDS victims, 2 percent contracted the disease from transfusions with infected blood or blood components, while 1 percent were hemophiliacs or had coagulation disorders.

Most victims of AIDS have been homosexual men and intravenous drug users. Health officials estimate that heterosexual contact is responsible for 4 percent of cases and that between 1 million and 1.5 million Americans have been exposed to the virus.

McKinney's press secretary, Diane Brockett, asked if the congressman had had homosexual contacts, said "Not that I know of. . . . He never told me about them."

Demos see agreement on budget

WASHINGTON (AP) — Democratic leaders predicted Thursday that Congress will agree swiftly on a fiscal 1988 budget, and Senate Republican leader Bob Dole warned President Reagan to start dealing with the Democrats.

But Reagan's spokesman said the president wouldn't hold the budget "summit" requested by the Democrats, even though he doesn't like their plans.

Meanwhile, the Senate in a surprise vote refused to waive the fiscal 1987 budget for a \$9 billion supplemental spending package needed to cover already-approved farm subsidies and federal pay and retirement costs this year.

The Senate completed action on its version of the \$1 trillion fiscal blueprint early Thursday by 56-42.

The Democratic-drafted plan, like one passed earlier by the House, calls for about \$18 billion in tax increases and protects domestic programs from deep cuts proposed by Reagan.

It plans to reduce the deficit but would leave about \$25 billion more in red ink than permitted under the Gramm-Rudman budget-balancing law.

A major difference is that the Senate plan would allow a \$7 billion boost in military spending if the president goes along with the tax increases. That and other details must be worked out in a House-Senate conference committee expected to convene next week.

House Speaker Jim Wright, D-Texas, endorsed the Senate's approach.

"The Senate is saying to the president that if you want higher defense spending, put your money where your mouth is and raise revenues," he said.

"We are tearing up the administration's credit card," said Senate Majority Leader Robert C. Byrd, D-W.Va. "I hope he (Reagan) will come to the table. A bipartisan budget is in the best interest of the nation."

Dole, of Kansas, said Reagan was right to let the Democrats produce a budget on their own. But it is time for the White House to abandon the strategy, he said.

"Now is the time for us to start sitting down together to see if there's some common ground between the Congress and the administration, and that means the president," Dole said. Reagan might wait for the House-Senate budget agreement, but "beyond that . . . it's too late," he said.

White House spokesman Marlin Fitzwater said administration officials continue to bring Reagan's views to Congress, but "we're not interested in a summit at this point. We are interested in budget reform."

Fitzwater said the administration will try to influence, and may have to veto, spending bills produced as a result of the budget resolution, which is itself an internal congressional document.

Deaver tied to discussion of envoy slot

WASHINGTON (AP) — Michael K. Deaver discussed with President Reagan the appointment of an envoy to Canada on acid rain before he left the White House to become a lobbyist for Canada, according to court papers filed Thursday.

The disclosure that Deaver personally discussed appointment of Drew Lewis as acid rain envoy with Deaver in 1985 was made by Whitney North Seymour Jr., the independent counsel who is prosecuting the former presidential aide on perjury charges.

Deaver is accused of lying to a federal grand jury about his lobbying for Canada and other clients after he resigned as deputy White House chief of staff in May 1985.

The indictment charges that Deaver lied to the grand jury by saying he had only limited involvement in the appointment of Lewis.

It also charges he lied about lobbying contacts to the grand jury and to a House subcommittee.

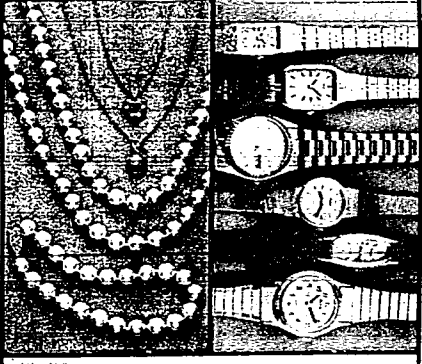
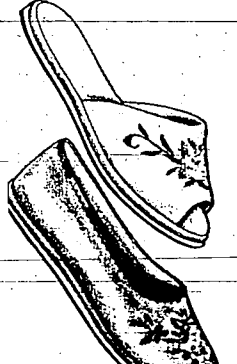
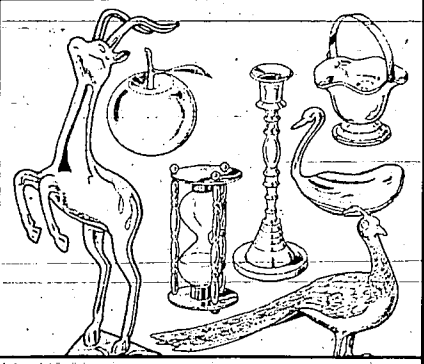

S. Africa swing alarms black leaders

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — The right-wing swing by South Africa's white voters alarmed black leaders and left liberals in disarray Thursday, while exuberant far-right voters pledged to seek tougher enforcement of apartheid laws.

"We have entered the dark ages of the history of our country," said Anglican Archbishop Desmond Tutu, the 1984 Nobel Peace Prize winner, reflecting the distress of many blacks at the results of Wednesday's parliamentary election.

Tutu predicted intensified protests by the voteless black majority as "an escalation of oppression" by officials from President P. W. Botha's National Party, which strengthened its hold on Parliament.

Botha, in a television interview, said the results should convey to the

country's foreign critics that "they cannot dictate to South Africa."

The far-right Conservative Party won 22 seats and 26 percent of the votes, replacing the liberal Progressive Federal Party as the country's main opposition party.

The National Party, in power since 1948, won 123 of the 166 elected seats in the Parliament's dominant chamber. The chamber has a total of 178 seats, including 12 appointed seats.

The Nationalists had 117 elected seats and the Conservatives 17 in the old Parliament.

The Progressive Federal Party was the main force in an informal liberal alliance which campaigned to abolish racially discriminatory laws and negotiate power-sharing with blacks. In a crushing rebuff by voters, it lost seven of its 26 elected

seats to the National Party. Another moderate member of the alliance, the New Republic Party, lost four of its five seats, and seven of eight independents also lost.

"We will have to re-examine our role and functions," said Progressive Federal Party leader Colin Eglin, who won his Cape Town seat. "There is no doubting that this is a setback for the PFP."

Tutu urged the party to withdraw from Parliament, saying such an action would underscore the contention of many blacks that their quest for political rights will never succeed in the legislative body.

Eglin blamed the reform party's poor showing on negative advertising by the National Party and "biased and servile" news coverage by the "government-controlled" South African Broadcasting Corp.

Responding to this charge, Alwyn Schlebusch, the Cabinet minister who oversees the broadcasting company, said the Progressives lost because voters perceived them as being tolerant of black radicals and unrest.

Botha, who called the election two years ahead of schedule, said he received a clear mandate from the whites to maintain security.

The National Party won 52.5 percent of the vote, down from 57 percent in the last white election in 1981.

The Conservative Party and another far-right party, together received 29 percent of the votes, nearly double the far-right's 1981 total.

Korean ministers discuss student protest wave

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — The prime minister called an emergency meeting Thursday to discuss a wave of anti-government protests on college campuses, and 300 students battled riot police in the capital, authorities said.

Prime Minister Lho Shin-yong ordered top police officials to keep a constant watch on campuses, set up guard posts at some college entrances and intervene quickly in protests.

"Police will move into campus wherever and wherever such action is considered necessary," National

Police Chief Lee Young-chang said after the meeting with Lho.

Some 300 students at Sogang University in Seoul fought riot police for two hours Thursday, hurling rocks and firebombs in a protest calling for political reform. Police used tear gas to keep the students from marching off the campus. There were no reports of injuries or arrests.

Lho called the emergency meeting after students battled police Wednesday in the provincial cities of Kwangju and Ansan. At least 30 people were injured in those clashes as students hurled rocks and sticks and

police responded with tear gas.

Education Minister Sohn Jae-suk issued a statement Thursday saying his ministry would do "whatever is necessary to restore order" in the university system.

A 30-year-old opposition activist tried to commit suicide Wednesday night by leaping about 36 feet from a tree during a clash in front of Myungdong Cathedral. The man, who was listed in critical condition in a hospital Thursday, scattered leaflets saying he hoped to embarrass the "military dictatorship" with his death.

Salvador denies helicopter downed

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador (AP) — The Salvadoran military was carrying dead and wounded Thursday denied that leftist guerrillas downed a U.S.-made helicopter that the rebels said was carrying wounded soldiers from fighting in the eastern zone.

The clandestine rebel Radio Venceremos said forces from the Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front caused the crash Wednesday night in the northeastern province of Morazan.

The broadcast said the helicopter was carrying dead and wounded soldiers, but did not specify how the craft was downed.

In denying the claim, the armed forces press office said the Huey UH-1H helicopter made an emergency landing because of mechanical difficulties. It also said the aircraft was ferrying children injured by rebel land mines.

Philippine unrest brings U.S. warning

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — The U.S. Embassy, in its most extensive travel advisory since Corazon Aquino became president, urged Americans Thursday to avoid large areas of the Philippines because of "relatively high levels of unrest."

In other developments Thursday, the country's main Muslim guerrilla organization announced that peace talks with the government had collapsed, and the military said eight policemen died in an ambush by Communist rebels.

The embassy advisory urged Americans to stay away from the Cagayan Valley of northern Luzon, the country's biggest island; the Muslim-dominated Sulu island chain; and all of Mindanao except the cities of Iligan, Davao and Cagayan de Oro. Mindanao, the Philippines' second-largest island, is about the size of Indiana.

In addition, the statement urged "extreme caution" when visiting most of northern and southeastern Luzon as well as parts of the central islands of Samar, Leyte, Negros and Panay.

Together, the regions make up at least half the Philippines' land area.

"These areas are experiencing relatively high levels of unrest and therefore hold the potential for violence," the statement said.

NATO continues mulling Gorbachev's offer on arms

BRUSSELS, Belgium — More than three weeks after Mikhail S. Gorbachev offered to widen the scope of nuclear disarmament in Europe, the European NATO countries are still mulling over a deal many believe is almost inevitable.

Analysis

Although the United States has quietly pressed its allies to reach a consensus rapidly on how to answer the Soviet offer, many officials at NATO headquarters believe a decision is unlikely before June.

The Reagan administration has suggested it could accept the Soviet offer but has insisted that it consult first with the allies.

"We are only in the middle of a process," said a senior official from one European NATO delegation, who would only discuss the matter privately.

Officials at North Atlantic Treaty Organization headquarters are excitedly discussing the offer, but their deliberations on the Soviet offer, in part because they want to avoid creating the impression that NATO is dragging its feet or that Europe is divided against its American ally.

The main problem for NATO is a split in views within West Germany's coalition government. But across said this is the rest of Europe is also uncertain about some crucial elements of the proposals put forward by Gorbachev on April 11.

the Geneva arms negotiations, which calls for banning shorter-range rockets only in the European region. The superpowers would be allowed to retain an unspecified number of these weapons out of reach of Europe.

The United States and the European NATO countries fear that without a global ban the Soviets could secretly reintroduce some of the shorter-range missiles in Europe.

Stalin hit with blame for woes

MOSCOW (AP) — A Soviet news agency published an interview Thursday that blamed Josef Stalin for many of the Soviet Union's economic problems.

The criticism of Stalin was by Anatoly Butenko, a department head at the Institute of the Economy of the World Socialist System, in an interview with the official news agency Novosti. He said Stalin disregarded the teachings of Marx and Lenin and built a large bureaucracy.

Publication of the interview appeared to be another tactic by those who support the leadership of Mikhail S. Gorbachev to pinpoint the bureaucratic inertia that can slow Gorbachev's reforms.

Stalin consolidated his power in the years after Lenin's death in 1924, exterminated his opponents and shaped the Soviet system in much the way that it exists today. The dictator died in 1953, and the Soviet Union still is struggling to come to grips with his legacy.

Since taking over as Communist Party chief in 1985, Gorbachev has sought to promote faster economic growth by cutting through red tape and make better use of modern equipment.

He and his supporters repeatedly have blamed shortcomings on "mistakes" and "negative tendencies" during the 1970s and early 1980s when Leonid I. Brezhnev was in power.

But the interview with Butenko, printed in the newspaper Mesto, skaya Pravda, traced the problems to Stalin's rule during the 1930s and 1940s.

Criticizing Stalin for the system that he built may make it easier for Soviet officials to make more radical changes and rehabilitate Bolsheviks who opposed Stalin and were executed by him.

Stalin rejected Marx's idea that government would wither away under communism and instead created a vast bureaucracy subservient to him, Butenko said.

Although the problems were entrenched in the Soviet system for years, their effects only started to be felt strongly decades later — in the 1960s and 1970s, Butenko said.

He said the 20th Communist Party Congress in 1956, at which Nik S. Khrushchev denounced Stalin, tried to overcome the Stalinist bureaucracy, but in the end was overwhelmed.

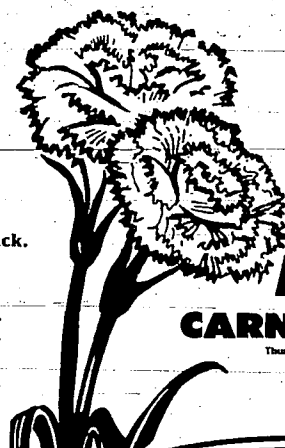

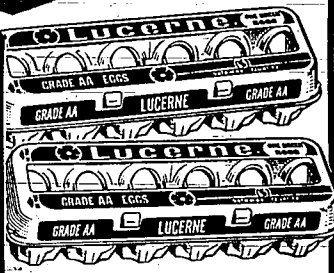

seats to the National Party. Another moderate member of the alliance, the New Republic Party, lost four of its five seats, and seven of eight independents also lost.

"We will have to re-examine our role and function," said Progressive Federal Party leader Colin Eglin, who won his Cape Town seat. "There is no doubting that this is a setback for the PFP."

Tutu urged the party to withdraw from Parliament, saying such an action would underscore the contention of many blacks that their quest for political rights will never succeed in the legislative body.

Eglin blamed the reform party's poor showing on negative advertising by the National Party and "biased and servile news coverage by the government-controlled South African Broadcasting Corp.

Responding to this charge, Alwyn Schlebusch, the Cabinet minister who oversees the broadcasting company, said the Progressives lost because voters perceived them as being tolerant of black radicals and unrest.

Botha, who called the election two years ahead of schedule, said he received a clear mandate from the whites to maintain security.

The National Party won 52.5 percent of the vote, down from 57 percent in the last white election in 1981.

The Conservative Party and another far-right party, the Reformed National Party, together received 29 percent of the votes — nearly double the far right's 1981 total.

Salvador denies helicopter downed

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador (AP) — The Salvadoran military Thursday denied that leftist guerrillas downed a U.S.-made helicopter that the rebels said was carrying wounded soldiers from fighting in the eastern zone.

The clandestine rebel Radio Venceremos said forces from the Farabundo Martí National Liberation Front caused the crash Wednesday night in the northeastern province of Morazan.

The broadcast said the helicopter was carrying dead and wounded soldiers, but did not specify how the craft was downed.

In denying the claim, the armed forces press office said the Huey UH-1H helicopter made an emergency landing because of mechanical difficulties. It also said the aircraft was ferrying children injured by rebel hand mines.

Radio Venceremos said several youngsters were injured in Morazan.

Korean ministers discuss student protest wave

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — The prime minister called an emergency meeting Thursday to discuss a wave of anti-government protests on college campuses, and 300 students battled riot police in the capital, authorities said.

Prime Minister Lee Shin-yong ordered top police officials to keep a constant watch on campuses, set up guard posts at some college entrances and intervene quickly in protests.

"Police will move into campus whenever and wherever such action is considered necessary," National

Police Chief Lee Young-chang said after the meeting with Lee.

Some 300 students at Sogang University in Seoul fought riot police for two hours Thursday, hurling rocks and firebombs in a protest calling for political reform. Police used tear gas to keep the students from marching up the campus. There were no reports of injuries or arrests.

Lee called the emergency meeting after students battled police Wednesday in the provincial cities of Kwangju and Ansan. At least 30 people were injured in those clashes as students hurled rocks and sticks and

police responded with tear gas.

Education Minister Sohn Jae-suk issued a statement Thursday saying his ministry would do "whatever is necessary to restore order" in the university system.

A 30-year-old opposition activist tried to commit suicide Wednesday night by leaping about 36 feet from a tree during a clash in front of Myungdong Cathedral. The man, who was listed in critical condition in a hospital Thursday, scattered leaflets saying he hoped to embarrass the government-controlled South African Broadcasting Corp. with his death.

Philippine unrest brings U.S. warning

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — The U.S. Embassy, in its most extensive travel advisory since Corazon Aquino became president, urged Americans Thursday to avoid large areas of the Philippines because of "relatively high levels of unrest."

In other developments Thursday, the country's main Muslim guerrilla organization announced that peace talks with the government had collapsed, and the military said eight policemen died in an ambush by Communist rebels.

The embassy advisory urged Americans to stay away from the Cagayan Valley of northern Luzon, the country's biggest island; the Muslim-dominated Sulu island chain; and all of Mindanao except the cities of Iligan, Davao and Cagayan de Oro. Mindanao, the Philippines' second-largest island, is about the size of Indiana.

In addition, the statement urged "extreme caution" when visiting most of northern and southeastern Luzon as well as parts of the central islands of Samar, Leyte, Negros and Panay.

Together, the regions make up at least half the Philippines' land area.

"These areas are experiencing relatively high levels of unrest and therefore hold the potential for violence," the statement said.

U.S. citizens are strongly urged to avoid travel to and within these areas.



NATO continues mulling Gorbachev's offer on arms

BRUSSELS, Belgium — More than three weeks after Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev offered to widen the scope of nuclear disarmament in Europe, the European NATO states are still mulling over a deal many believe is almost inevitable.

Although the United States has quietly pressed its allies to reach a consensus rapidly on how to answer the Soviet offer, many officials at NATO headquarters believe a decision will be made before the end of the year.

The Reagan administration has suggested it could accept the Soviet offer but has insisted that it consult first with the allies.

"It's very difficult for us to resist it," said one senior alliance official. "Some European leaders and NATO military authorities fear a deal including short-range missiles would tear too large a hole in the alliance's strategy of 'flexible response.'"

That strategy allows NATO to answer a Warsaw Pact conventional attack with a full range of nuclear and non-nuclear arms.

Missile deployment balance

The Soviet Union's proposal for eliminating medium- and shorter-range nuclear missiles in Europe calls for a much larger cutback in Soviet than U.S. arsenals.

Here is a breakdown of the superpowers' current deployments of medium-range and shorter-range rockets.

MEDIUM RANGE — 620 to 3,100 miles

Soviets: 441 SS-20 missiles, each with three warheads. Americans: 108 Pershing 2 single-warhead missiles, based at three sites in West Germany, plus 208 Tomahawk single-warhead cruise missiles in Britain, West Germany, Italy and Belgium.

Each side would be allowed to keep 100 of these warheads outside the reach of Europe.

Stalin hit with blame for woes

MOSCOW (AP) — A Soviet news agency published an interview Thursday that blamed Josef Stalin for many of the Soviet Union's economic problems.

The criticism of Stalin was by Anatoly Butenko, a department head at the Institute of the Economy of the World Socialist System, in an interview with the official news agency Novosti. He said Stalin disregarded the teachings of Marx and Lenin and built a large bureaucracy.

Publication of the interview appeared to be another tactic by those who support the leadership of Mikhail S. Gorbachev to pinpoint the blame for the economic ills that can slow Gorbachev's reforms.

Stalin consolidated his power in the years after Lenin's death in 1924, exterminated his opponents and shaped the Soviet system in much the way that it exists today. The dictator died in 1953, and the Soviet Union still is struggling to come to grips with his legacy.

Since taking over as Communist Party chief in 1985, Gorbachev has sought to promote faster economic growth by cutting through red tape, encouraging people to work harder and make better use of modern equipment.

He and his supporters repeatedly have blamed shortcomings on "mistakes" and "negative tendencies" during the 1970s and early 1980s when Leonid I. Brezhnev was in power.

But the interview with Butenko, printed in the newspaper Moskovskaya Pravda, traced the problems to Stalin's rule during the 1920s and 1930s.

Criticizing Stalin for the system that he built may make it easier for Soviet officials to make more radical changes and rehabilitate leaders who opposed Stalin and were executed by him.

Stalin rejected Marx's idea that government would wither away under communism and instead created a vast bureaucracy subservient to him, Butenko said.

Although the problems were entrenched in the Soviet system for years, their effects only started to be felt strongly decades later — in the 1960s and 1970s, Butenko said.

He said the 20th Communist Party Congress in 1956, at which Nikita S. Khrushchev denounced Stalin, tried to overcome the Stalinist bureaucracy but in the end was overwhelmed.

Jail costs lie in meeting standards

But standards may provide defense against inmate lawsuits

TWIN FALLS — It sounds almost like a bad joke.

Why is a jail more expensive to build than a church or a house? The punchline, however, is one taxpayers in particular may not find amusing.

Nationwide, the costs of building a jail run between \$100,000 to \$200,000 per bed, depending on financing, according to a 1984 U.S. Justice Department report on modern jails.

On Tuesday, Twin Falls County residents will be asked to approve a \$3.8-million bond to finance a new 90-bed, 27,303 square-foot jail. Of that amount, \$1.5 million is the estimated total construction cost, which works out to about \$128 per square foot. The cost includes everything from landscaping to the best down bunks to a contractor's markup.

The remainder of the bond amount will pay for professional fees and bond costs.

Jails are more expensive because you have got a totally contained system, food service, laundry and all the life-safety requirements," says Ernie Lombard, who's Boise firm of Lombard-Carmichael Architects designed the proposed facility.

Jails are more expensive to construct than other types of buildings because highly-durable materials, such as concrete and steel normally used as structural materials, are used inside for security reasons, he says.

The building proposed by the county will be constructed of concrete block reinforced with steel rods. The floors and ceiling above the cells will be concrete.

In comparison, residential and commercial buildings are made of less expensive materials.

If jails were built of sheet rock and wood, says Sheriff Jim Munn, he couldn't hire enough men to keep the inmates from digging through the walls to escape.

One of the costliest items in the proposed jail construction will be the electrical work at an estimated cost of \$512,880. Aside from the usual electrical equipment, doors throughout the building will be electronically controlled. There will also be surveillance gear.

The proposed county jail has been designed to meet nationally recommended standards of the American Correctional Association, a Maryland-based non-profit organization.

ACA standards aren't mandatory, Munn says. But the county will follow them because they are court-approved and nationally recognized. Following the standards provides a good defense against inmate lawsuits.

If the county made up its own standards, it could be putting itself "out on a limb," Munn adds.

Lombard says, "They (the standards) tend to stand up in court."

The modern jail described in the ACA standards is a long way from the jails of 20-years-ago where steel

State panel to appoint committees to deal with chemical hazards

TWIN FALLS — When a business or public facility releases extremely hazardous chemicals into the environment, it is now required to notify local emergency planning committees, area government and law enforcement officials were told here Thursday.

The committees will be set up here and across the state by August 17 and they must produce a local emergency response plan no later than October 1988, according to information presented at a state Bureau of Disaster Services conference held at KMVT-TV. About 50 people attended, including representatives from Twin Falls and Cassia counties.

The committees will be appointed by a state commission and will include local elected officials, law enforcement officers, civil defense personnel, health and hospital officials, members of the print and broadcast media and facility owners and operators.

Twin Falls County and a number of other counties already have emergency response plans to deal with natural disasters such as floods, droughts and earthquakes.

How the new emergency planning

committees will fit into these plans is something the Bureau of Disaster Services hopes to learn from county and law enforcement officials attending the one-day conference, said Ross Mayfield, operations manager, Bureau of Disaster Services.

Similar conferences were held in Pocatello on Wednesday and Idaho Falls on Tuesday. Sessions in Boise, Coeur d'Alene and Lewiston were held last month.

Twin Falls County's plan is being rewritten to comply with the new requirements, said Twin Falls County Commissioner Jim Fraley.

Following the Bhopal chemical disaster in India three years ago, policies are changing in this country about how chemical emergencies are handled.

The requirement for emergency planning committees is part of amendments to the Superfund law which were passed by Congress last October. Superfund deals with the identification and cleanup of the most hazardous waste sites in the country.

In India the damage was done by the time emergency response personnel arrived, according to information presented at the conference.

Emergency response to chemical accidents is not enough, according to

BELLEVUE — The Bellevue City Council has agreed in a split vote to pass a building ordinance amendment required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency regulating building in the flood plain.

Unless the council passes the ordinance the city will be denied flood insurance. However, members have been reluctant to approve it because

they believe too much land has been designated as part of the flood plain.

Councilman Ronald Reese opposed passing the ordinance this week, saying that by passing the ordinance the city would put a stamp of approval upon the FEMA studies which currently designate some areas on the east side of the railroad tracks in Bellevue as flood plain.

Not passing the ordinance would give the city leverage by which to get the flood plain designation

changed, he said.

However, attorney Keith Roark told the council that the city could be put in a dangerous position by taking the risk this year when flood danger was minimal with the idea the flood insurance program would be approved by next year before the flood season began.

The council voted 4-2, with Reese and Dale Eversen opposed, to pass the ordinance at the next council meeting. See BELLEVUE on Page B2

Hagerman P&Z chief gets council support

HAGERMAN — The administrator of the Hagerman Planning and Zoning Commission has been given a "vote of confidence" by the City Council.

At the council meeting Tuesday, Charlie Carter of the zoning commission said he does not want to enforce the zoning laws unless the council will back his decisions.

"I think I need a definite word from the council to enforce the ordinance as it is written," Carter said.

The matter came up after residents asked the council last month to prevent an automobile and used-parts business from expanding. Mayor Merle Oswley said the city had received complaints that Leslie Lynch was expanding his business by starting to put cars on his property across the street from his existing business. Lynch already has 50 to 60 automobiles parked on six lots near the city park.

Expanding the business on the additional land would violate zoning ordinances. However, Lynch has said that he does not intend to expand his business, nor antagonize his neighbors.

If Carter does find that zoning ordinances are being violated, he said he would want to know the council will support him in enforcing them.

"If I go after it, I'll go after it to win . . .," he said.

Council member Rolly Zollinger said the ordinances must be enforced carefully so no one's rights are violated.

Carter said that vehicles parked on the additional property, whether they are personal vehicles or not, constitute a business expansion.

"Five neighbors have complained," he said. "Three of the five are really upset."

Oswley and the council members voted unanimously to give Carter their full support. They also voted to buy a camera for Carter to use to take pictures of the land in question.

In other business, Oswley proclaimed May 17 to 23 as Poppy Week in Hagerman. The event is to raise money for the American Legion.

Physician teaches art of hip, knee replacement to doctors in India

TWIN FALLS — A Magic Valley orthopedist recently got a first-hand look at life in India, and was overwhelmed by the undisputed contrasts within the country — and the contrasts with everyday life in Twin Falls.

Medically, culturally and economically, "the contrasts are absolutely unbelievable," says Twin Falls orthopedist Robert Porter, who spent 12 days in February and March studying, teaching and advising his professional peers in three of India's hospitals.

Porter was part of a three-man team of U.S. orthopedists sent by Johnson and Johnson health care supply company, who recently donated \$15 million worth of knee and hip replacements to three hospitals in India. The orthopedists were sent to help Indian doctors learn to use the gift.

That supply of joint replacements is enough to last many years, says Porter, and represents an incredible cost savings to those needing the surgery.

A single knee joint is worth about \$2,500 here, says Porter, and knee replacement surgery costs close to \$15,000. That same surgery now costs just \$400 in the three Indian hospitals selected by Johnson and Johnson.

Porter was recruited for the trip by Dr. Chitranjan (Chit) S. Ranawat, orthopedic surgeon at New York's Hospital for Special Surgery, Manhattan. Ranawat was raised in Indore, India, where a portion of the joint replacements were sent.

The other member of the team is Los Angeles orthopedist Lawrence Dorr.

Ranawat and Dorr are experts in total joint replacement, says Porter, who describes himself more of a "general orthopedist" who regularly works on fractures of the thigh, knee and hip.

Johnson and Johnson chose hospitals in Bombay, Indore and Pune to receive the joint replacements, and that's where the team's work was focused.

"The trip was no vacation at all," says Porter. Within hours of their arrival (and before they had recovered from jet lag and the 12-hour time change), the three orthopedists set off on a whirlwind itinerary that included two professional conferences in Bombay and three days of medical work, plus visits to three hospitals and countless informal presentations to doctors.

The three hospitals receiving the replacement joints have medical expertise and equipment comparable to that at Magic Valley's Regional Medical Center, says Porter. But not all hospitals are as modern. It's not uncommon for orthopedists in India

Andrus said Idaho should beef up its budget for the project, if it is to have a legitimate chance.

Virginia computer firm to send help to fix welfare computer

BOISE (AP) — A Virginia company that installed the programs for the state's welfare computer system will send representatives to Boise on Tuesday to start working on problems with the system.

Health and Welfare Director Rich Donovan on Thursday held a teleconference with Peter Sandford and other officials of Systemhouse, Inc., Arlington, Va.

The company put together much of the \$8.2 million EPIC computer welfare system.

The system was launched in November, and was supposed to provide state-of-the-art ability to determine welfare eligibility and issue benefit checks to the 20,000 Idaho families receiving welfare payments each month.

But it has been plagued with problems from the outset, with many welfare recipients complaining of delayed checks or no checks.

Sen. Phil Batt, R-Willard, presented a report to Gov. Cecil Andrus on Wednesday, recommending that the state not abandon the system, but instead put enough money in it to make it work properly.

Donovan's teleconference on Thursday was the first step in that process.

Once Sandford and other Systemhouse employees

review the state's "fix" plan for the system, Deputy Director Chuck Moss, said it should become clear how long it will take, and what it will cost.

Batt estimated the "fix" cost at between \$100,000 and \$1 million, but acknowledged that was only a guess.

Batt was critical of an ongoing conflict between the supplier and Health and Welfare, over fixing the problems.

"It's got to be an integrated effort this time," said Moss.

Donovan also issued a statement, saying he found Batt's report "fair, balanced and technically accurate," and pledging full department cooperation with the effort at a "fix."

"I am committed to working with Systemhouse and others to insure that the system works at top efficiency," said Donovan. "Systemhouse has assured me they will provide their most knowledgeable people to work on each and every problem we have identified," he said.

Donovan said he was thankful that Batt recommended additional support for the department.

"This department does not have much slack, if any, between its many service obligations and the money to pay for such services," he said.

Idahoans say reports fatal to Hart

POCATELLO, Idaho (AP) — Gov. Cecil Andrus and Idaho Democratic Party Chairman Mel Morgan say Gary Hart's presidential campaign has been severely damaged by reports Hart spent a weekend with a 29-year-old actress and model.

"As far as I'm concerned, Gary Hart is history," said Andrus, who served as Interior secretary in the Jimmy Carter Administration. "A candidate can have somebody laugh with them, but not at them, and the whole world is laughing at how stupid that situation is."

Officials in the Hart campaign said Thursday afternoon that Hart has abandoned his quest for the Democratic presidential nomination

next year.

Andrus admitted he has "never been a Gary Hart supporter," but he said for Hart to continue to campaign for the presidency would be futile.

"His conduct has been, to say the least, not very intelligent," said Andrus.

Morgan, meanwhile, said the reports of Hart's weekend with Donna Rice damaged his campaign "without a doubt." Morgan also admitted, however, that "Hart has never been my favorite candidate."

Both Idaho Democrats, who will be automatic delegates to the national convention in Atlanta in 1988, said they will go to the convention un-

committed. Andrus said he is statutorily required to be uncommitted, but he added that so far he hasn't found a Democratic candidate he strongly supports.

He was chairman of the Walter Mondale campaign in Idaho in 1984. In the nonbinding Idaho-Democratic presidential primary, Hart captured 31,737 votes to 16,460 for Mondale, with other candidates getting a scattering of support.

After party caucuses, Hart had 12 delegates, Mondale 7 and three went to the convention uncommitted.

"I find myself sitting on the curb, watching the parade go by," said Andrus. "I think what I would like to see is to have one of them (candidates) stand up and tell it the way it is with regards to the real issues of the day."

Leaking ammonia alters traffic flow

ST. ANTHONY (AP) — Traffic along U.S. 20 north of St. Anthony was rerouted for about two hours after a trailer containing anhydrous ammonia broke loose from a truck and leaked the liquid fertilizer.

Payette Lake gates closing

MCCALL (AP) — Central Idaho Irrigators say they will begin holding back water in Payette Lake as much as a month earlier than normal this year because of the drought conditions hanging over the state.

Gates of the Lake Irrigation Co. were being closed this week below the Lardo Bridge to raise the lake level 5 1/2 feet at the dam, spokesman Myrtle Haines said.

The move is normally made late this month or in early June. But in addition — to ensuring adequate storage for irrigation, the increase in the water level will clear the way for earlier than normal recreational use of the lake as water reaches boat docks sooner.

Haines said that with the earlier retention of water, the irrigation company should be able to store its allotted capacity in the lake this year. But he also said the prediction for hot, dry weather in the months ahead could force irrigators to begin drawing on the lake before September.

Utah health office drafts AIDS policy

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — The State Health Department on Thursday released a draft of a new policy that would allow employees who contract AIDS to remain on the job unless they pose a risk to others.

Fellow workers who show "a continued, unreasonable refusal... to work with an infected co-worker" could face disciplinary action, the policy says.

Clients coming to state agencies for services also cannot be discriminated against on the basis of their having AIDS. State employees who refuse services to such clients may be disciplined under terms of the proposed policy.

Many state departments, including state-run hospitals and the corrections system, already have developed policies regarding AIDS, said Craig J. Nichols, state epidemiologist.

The proposed policies and procedures will serve as a guide to other state units and have been distributed to department heads for study and comment.

The policy concept was first discussed with all agency directors

and Gov. Norm Bangerter in a cabinet meeting.

"State employees known to have AIDS shall not be isolated or dismissed but should be treated as if they were affected with any other life-threatening disease," the draft policy says.

However, AIDS patients who develop a related infection such as tuberculosis that could be a hazard to others may be restricted in work activities. More cases of tuberculosis are being reported among AIDS patients nationally, Nichols said, although Utah has had only one confirmed case.

Employees who work in jobs that involve health care or blood contact must inform their supervisors of an AIDS infection and consult with the Bureau of Epidemiology to avoid transmission to patients or clients.

The policy also protects individuals against involuntary testing for the presence of the AIDS virus. Testing cannot be required as a precondition for employment or insurance coverage or for admission to hospitals or schools.

Prisoners at Orofino may sue, charge bias

OROFINO (AP) — Male prisoners at the Idaho Correctional Institution-Orofino say they'll sue over what they say are discrimination and crowded living conditions at the prison.

The class-action suit, which inmate Daniel Fowler said may be filed within days, alleges discrimination against male prisoners at Orofino because they live under harsher conditions than male inmates at the Idaho State Penitentiary near Boise and the North Idaho Correctional Institution near Cottonwood.

The suit will allege a lack of recreation, education, job and rehabilitation opportunities, Fowler said.

Meanwhile, two female inmates at Orofino, Penny Walton and Lois Witke, said prison officials are taking away privileges and furnishings

from female inmates to quell growing hostility among the facility's male population.

"Anytime anything comes down up here, it's the women's loss," said Ms. Walton. "We're overpopulated here with all the men. They're bringing more men in here like crazy."

The Orofino facility, which opened three years ago, was remodeled from an old hospital and originally was intended for women only.

But male inmates, beginning with geriatric prisoners, and then younger inmates, including those convicted of violent crimes, were transferred to Orofino.

The last official population of Orofino was listed at 225, or 120 percent of the prison's capacity of 192. The prison includes 40 female inmates.

Hecla offer due study

KELLOGG (AP) — A meeting of United Steelworkers Local 5114 will be called May 16 to study a new back-to-work offer by Hecla Mining Co., union officials said.

Negotiations in Kellogg ended Wednesday night with modifications and movement on the company's part on key contract issues, said Steven Brown, union local spokesman.

Based on that movement, the negotiating committee has agreed that we will take a proposal back to the membership and explain it in detail," Brown said.

Brown refused to disclose terms of the new offer. Union members won't have a written version of the agree-

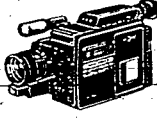
ment until at least Friday.

SAC says flight hearings unlikely

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — The Strategic Air Command is unlikely to respond to a request by environmentalists to hold public hearings in Utah on new flight training paths they say are taking low-flying jets over scenic recreational areas, a SAC official says.

Maj. Fred Harrop, spokesman for SAC headquarters in Omaha, said such requests are seldom considered unless they come from "a legitimate governmental agency."

At a Thursday news conference, Steve Erickson, Utah coordinator for Western Solidarity, said the Air Force began using the new routes last month without seeking public comment.

He said the routes take fighters and bombers from several bases over the Glen Canyon National Recreation Area, the Rainbow Bridge National Monument and Montezuma Creek in San Juan County, near primitive areas popular with hikers and boaters.

Harrop defended the procedures used to establish the new routes nationwide, and said in Utah's case, the flights over San Juan County were merely an extension of routes used for the last 25 years. He said SAC had conducted an extensive environmental assessment before implementing the new routes.

Alan Miller, Utah field representative for the Sierra Club, said the aircraft are leaving their routes and flying over other recreation areas in southern Utah. He said he has witnessed fighters flying as low as 100 feet over Arches National Park near Moab.

"One of the questions the Sierra Club has is that these guys fly where they want to fly," Miller said. "Those guys have a lot of fun when they're flying."

However, Harrop said the Air Force had "received no complaints of any kind since we began flying (the southeastern Utah) route about 30 days ago."

Erickson said the new routes over Utah are part of a nationwide expansion of routes for low-level Air Force training. He said the Air Force is holding hearings in some states to gather information for an environmental impact statement, but Utah has not been included.

California threatens to pass up BPA power

WASHINGTON (AP) — California may turn to other sources of electricity if the Bonneville Power Administration keeps trying to limit access to that market and charging it more for surplus power than it charges in the Pacific Northwest, California officials warned Congress on Thursday.

If this happens, continued Charles R. Imbrecht, chairman of the California Energy Commission, both regions will be worse off, since each will have excess generating capacity that will stand idle at times when it could serve the other and will be used when the other's could be serving it.

"There are a variety of other technologies available to us which are less expensive and which we intend to pursue if we can't make an equitable arrangement," Imbrecht told the water and power resources subcommittee of the House Interior Committee.

He said he was thinking of the small-power producers who have blossomed in California under federal laws requiring utilities to buy their output.

The committee held the first in what is expected to be several hearings on Bonneville's proposed permanent policy for access to the Pacific Intertie, the transmission lines into California it effectively controls.

California sales provided about 20 percent of Bonneville's revenue in 1985, \$411 million. They fell to \$276 million last year, when the agency reduced California prices in step with falling oil and gas prices.

Bonneville faced with the need to repay the Treasury more than \$600 million a year in interest and principal on its debt, bases prices on its low hydro-power costs for its public, private and industrial customers in the Pacific Northwest. Losing sales to others, it tightened access to the intertie, a temporary policy and sold power to California at whatever it thought it could get.

Imbrecht said Bonneville was projecting a price of 211 cents per kilowatt hour for California vs. 134 cents for the rest of the state. The conditions to its at-home customers this year.

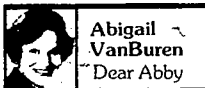

Lysol abuse worries officers

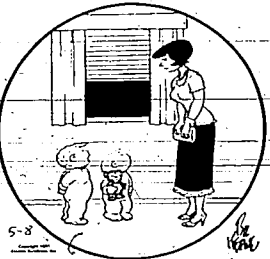

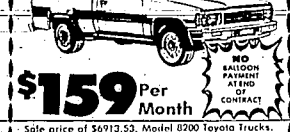

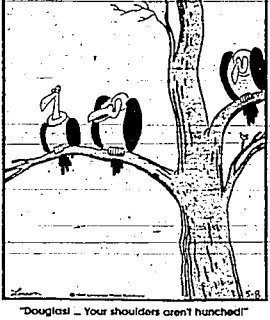

Band director hits big sounds on small scale

Buhl's Wayne Skeem added electronic instruments to lineup

BUHL — Wayne Skeem, band director for Buhl junior and senior high schools, has a mild manner which belies his enthusiasm set in overdrive.

He quietly demands — and usually gets — top-notch performances from each of the musicians in his highly regarded school band program. It is a program which has gained local and even a little national attention.

"I think our program is unique in that we've solved a lot of the problems small schools are experiencing right now," said the soft-spoken, talkative Skeem, who took over Buhl's distressed band program two years ago.

"It's hard for a small band to have public appeal and musical appeal if they don't ever get off the ground, you know? We overcame it by really, we could not be a marching band."

Given the small number of students he was working with, the financial constraints his program was under and the demands placed on his own time, Skeem decided that small ensembles and stage and concert band formats would best display his pupils' talents.

"I knew our program had to be zero in on something and try to excel in one area first. I decided that I was going to go with the small ensembles and then have one of those, right away, by exemplary," he said.

Skeem also added an electronic piano, a digital keyboard and digital percussion to the instrument lineup. The electronic expansion enabled him to choose from hundreds of different simulated instrumental tones and rhythms. He uses those tones to supplement the sounds students are making on traditional instruments and give his small band a "bigger" sound.

"We're not interested in one person handling everything at this point. But, for ensembles, when you don't want to take away a drummer, or you don't want to take someone on rhythm percussion, we can customize a sequence of rhythm patterns and things to fit a particular selection that we're doing. It can all be recorded on a chip and then just drawn up whenever the place is right," he said.

"The kids are pretty sharp on this

stuff. They love it. They just really can't hardly keep their hands off. But that's great, isn't it?"

Skeem's strategies designed to give his group "crowd appeal" have so far proven effective.

The Bands of America Magazine, a national publication for high school band teachers and students, featured an article written by Skeem on the importance of small ensembles in high school music programs.

In addition, officials at Weber State University in Ogden, Utah, are interested in having their student teachers in music education review Skeem's program.

"Mr. Skeem organizes everything," says Lori Schlaick, a 16-year-old sophomore who sometimes plays the electronic piano. "He's constantly calling people or having people call him. He just has so many things going and he's pushing so much. He gets us into so many places. It's kind of like we're pizzazzed to be in this band."

Students traveled to the state capital in November to play for the Idaho School Board Association's convention. There they received a standing ovation from enthusiastic band members.

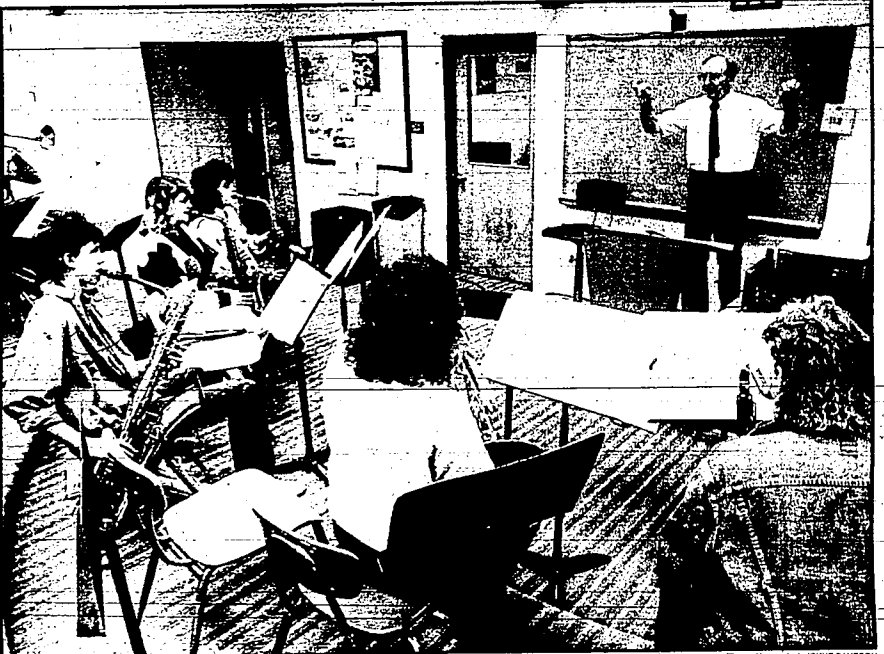
They also attended a district-wide music festival last week in Burley where their playing was critiqued by judges. The band received a superior rating and individual students' abilities drew comments from the judges such as "love most nature," "I'm impressed" and "keep group going."

All in all, members of what Skeem calls his "hurry up, let's move it" band have given 28 band performances and 12 small ensemble performances this school year.

"It's always been my policy when we go out and play, even a ballgame, to try to play better," said Skeem.

"We consider it an important performance. We don't consider it trivial. I don't use student conductors. I do it myself because I want them to completely strive to play in tune and not get sloppy and careless. If you're careless at ballgames, you have a whole season of practicing carelessness."

Skeem said that the past inconsistency of having a series of band directors in Buhl who "marched through the program one year at a time" left students dispirited and the band room a mess.

"When I came and looked at this program here, I walked through the band room and you should have seen the situation here. I thought, 'Oh boy, do I really want to do this?'"

Given his previously successful career as a high school band director in New Mexico, students and administrators were glad when Skeem decided he did indeed want to do it.

Skeem's Elko County bands, when he spent 12 years, had won competitions in Nevada and California. His marching band represented the state of Nevada in a presidential inaugural parade honoring Richard

Nixon and performed at halftime during a San Francisco 49ers game. They were also featured in an hour-long regional television broadcast.

"Music is only fun if you can get up to a certain level of musical performance. Then it's really thrilling for both the students and the director. Anything less than that is hard work," says Skeem.

What began as hard work is becoming more and more fun for members of the Buhl band.

"Mr. Skeem really turned it around," said Gary Thomas, 17, student band president. "The year be-

fore Mr. Skeem came we ended up at (the music) festival with a 2 minus (low rating). Either that or a 3. I can't remember which."

"I don't think there's any question that in the last two years the program has improved dramatically," agreed Gus Spiropoulos, Buhl school superintendent. "As far as public relations go, it's been a real boost."

Skeem said that while improving discipline has been necessary in revamping the music program, giving the students a reachable goal has also been important.

"I can vividly remember the first day," he said. "I had these 30 kids come in and I just quickly and sternly said, 'Here's what we're going to have.' I reasoned that if half of them got up and walked out and we only had a trumpet, a drum and a clarinet or whatever, I'd rather start there with kids that were dedicated to the idea."

"So I told them we were going to make music that would thrill people. And that we were going to grow and it would be something we could all be proud of. They put down their pop bottles and listened from then on."

First-time novelist captures fiction award

WASHINGTON (AP) — Richard Willey, whose first novel details the experiences of two Japanese-Americans stranded in Japan after the bombing of Pearl Harbor, captured the 1987 Pen-Faulkner Award for Fiction, officials announced Sunday.

Willey will receive \$5,000 at a ceremony at the Folger Shakespeare Library on May 9. The four runners-up are Richard Ford, Maureen Howard, Charles Johnson and Janet Kauffman — will receive \$1,000 apiece.

The winning novel, titled "Soldiers in Hiding," is based on Willey's studies in Tokyo and a friendship with a Japanese-American who had lost his U.S. citizenship after being drafted in the Japanese army.

The award's judges said the novel is "a work of the imagination that is as down to earth as it is brilliant... will — have — no — trouble-

recognizing every aspect of ourselves and the human condition in all of its complex spiritual simplicity."

Atlantic Monthly Press is the publisher of Willey's first novel.

The other works nominated included Ford's "The Sportswriter," published by Vintage; Howard's "Expensive Habits," published by Scribner; Johnson's "Apprentice" published by Atheneum; and Kauffman's "Collaborators," published by Knopf.

Stars arrive in force for Cannes Film Festival

CANNES, France (AP) — The Cannes Film Festival opened Thursday with Americans back in force and thousands of autograph seekers converging on the red-carpeted entrance.

Frightened away last year by terrorism in Europe, Hollywood's brightest stars turned out for the festival's 40th anniversary celebrations.

The opening ceremonies were dedicated to directors the world over, with special tributes to Italy's Bernardo Bertolucci, Richard Brooks of the United States and Swedish veteran Ingmar Bergman.

The 65-year-old actor and singer said his choice for the winning film would be something that "reached out and grabbed me."

"It either has punch or it doesn't," he said. "It can be a grand spectacle, an intimate portrait or even something experimental, but it has to touch me, annoy me or make me angry... It cannot be flat."

Among the celebrities expected for the festival are Norman Mailer, a jury member and director of "Tough Guys Don't Dance," starring Ryan O'Neal and Isabella Rossellini; Mia Farrow; Diane Keaton, who is making her Cannes directing debut with "Heaven"; and Mickey Rourke and heroes in French director Barbet Schroeder's "Barfly."

Academy Award winner Paul Newman will take center stage May 12 when he presents "The Glass Menagerie," the Tennessee Williams drama starring his wife, Joanne Woodward, and Karen Allen.

The 12-day movie extravaganza, perhaps the world's most lavish tribute to the silver screen, was launched with the showing of "Un Homme Amoureux," ("A Man in Love).

Directed by France's Diane Kurys, best known for her comedies based on the emotional entanglements of everyday living, it tells the story of a popular film actor who falls in love with his co-star.

The movie is in English, and stars Peter Coyote, Jamie Lee Curtis, Greta Scacchi and Claudia Cardinale.

LA museum sets pace with modernist exhibitions

LOS ANGELES — The Los Angeles County Museum of Art is on a roll. Its new Robert O. Anderson Building for modern and contemporary art has galvanized both the museum and its artistic character. In five months since its opening, a series of special exhibitions has tumbled into the museum like boot-camp recruits answering reveille.

Fall in for Picasso drawings and Renaissance bronzes. Dress right in "Treasures From the Holy Land."

Double-time bustle in the new graphic and photography galleries. Quickly, quickly to the basement for the new Rifkind Center for German Experimental Studies. Hup, hup, hup. Fall out for the smart Smokey collection from Degas to Picasso.

The charge of the place is amazing. Instead of taking a well-deserved breather after a major construction, it is functioning with the drive of the Met. Its inaugural modernist exhibition, "The Spiritual in Art," was a landmark look at metaphysics in modernism, intelligent and timely, despite notable muddling. Originated by museum curator Maurice Tuchman, it added itself to shows like "The Avant-Garde in Russia" and Stephanie Barron's "German Expressionist Sculpture" to prove that LACMA, as it is known, at its best rivals the Museum of Modern Art at its best.

But that's it for a while, right? Nobody can reasonably expect a museum to author shows of this quality more than every couple of years. Yes, but this museum is not currently reasonable; it is ecstatic. The mood has clearly setted young contemporary art curator Howard Fox. His first major exhibition grabs a very, ungly bull by the short horns.

"Avant-Garde in the '80s" is the first exhibition known to me to have the guts to try to define the decade's Post-Modernism. Whatever may be said hereafter, it is an exhibition that moves Los Angeles to the forefront in the thoughtful evaluation of the present, an act that requires as much courage as brains.

Fox has assembled about 150 works by almost as many artists, ranging from art market superstars like Robert Longo and David Salle to indigenous chieftains like Roland Reiss and Masami Terakoa. The show is so crammed that it begins to

feel like LACMA's energy has already overrun the new gallery space. It fans out vertiginously, scooping up European trans-avant-garde carpebaggers like Francesco Clemente and Giulio Paolini and strains at its seams by stuffing in a bit of architecture in photos and models by the likes of Phillip Johnson and Charles Moore.

Such surveys are messy by definition. The desire to see artists in depth is frustrated. The eye is overloaded, causing meltdown in the mental circuits. The only hope is that the exhibition-catalog-essay and arrangement of the works will blend into epiphanies of insight about the state of art and the condition of the cultural soul.

Fox's essay bravely undertakes to define the Post-Mod phenomenon. He says advanced artists of the '80s are particularly preoccupied with the notion of originality, questioning the crucial value placed on it by the old modernist avant-garde. They are

concerned about the relationship of the artist to society, often rejecting the hermit-like outsider role, purposely played by pioneers from the Dadaists to the Abstract Expressionists. In favor of making art more accessible to a broad audience and more actively involved in the political and cultural life of the society.

"It may be," says Fox, "that contemporary artists are indeed engaged in creating an art that is related to a moral order, as were their predecessors."

Unlike the subversive posture of the modernists, however, Fox suggests that the Post-Mod artist may be out to resume the role of the pre-modernist artist, "to sustain religious beliefs, perpetuate ethical values, maintain a historical continuity of the culture with its past and further the artistic traditions of that culture."

Junior Club's art auction nets \$5,000 for charity

TWIN FALLS — The Junior Club's annual Idaho Art Show for charity was a financial success, according to club president Beverly Claiborne.

Claiborne said sales grossed \$10,000 with a net profit of just over \$5,000 going to charity.

That amount is more than enough to fulfill the club's financial pledges to Volunteers Against Violence, the Twin Falls County Historical Museum and The Perrine School Library, Claiborne said.

Members of the Junior Club will vote to decide which charities will receive portions of the surplus funds.

The art auction featured the work of wildlife artist Blaine Billman, who unveiled a pencil drawing of a reclining nude female figure entitled "Stephanie at Rest."

"The reason I like drawing the human body, especially a woman's, is that it is such an incredible vision of form and shading, much like what you see in sand dunes," Billman said.

The artist admits it was an unusual choice of subjects to present to a conservative audience which considers him a "wildlife" artist. "I wanted it to be a memorable show," he said. "You only get to do the Junior Club auction once (as featured artist) and I didn't want to waste the opportunity."

Orchestra plays P.D.Q. Bach for laughs

NEW YORK (AP) — Conductor Peter Schickel thanked the New York Philharmonic for allowing the music of P.D.Q. Bach to invade its repertoire during the Philharmonic's pension fund benefit concert, constantly interrupted by audience laughter.

The program, by the "profoundly shallow composer," included his "Pervertimento," which Schickel — who "discovered" all — of P.D.Q.'s works, called "not so much a title as an opinion," and "1712 Overture," which Schickel said, shows Tchaikovsky up as a plagiarist.

The concert was held at Avery Fisher Hall on Saturday night.

Schickel, who usually works with smaller forces than the New York Philharmonic, billed himself as "semiconductor," soloist and apologist. "When he played an instrument, as the siren attached to the back wheel of an exercise bicycle, whose tonal shriek varied with its pedaling speed, in "Pervertimento," Andrew Davis conducted.

Schickel himself compiled "Last Tango in Bayreuth," a collection of melodies from Wagner operas done in a rhythm Wagner never thought of. This was played — a first for this version — by four bassoonists from the Philharmonic and bassoonist Joseph Polisi, president of the Juilliard School.

There were musical jokes and verbal puns. "Bach-Portrait," which Schickel said he composed "to do for Bach what Aaron Copland did for Lincoln," had musical quotes from Copland's "Appalachian Spring" and Stephen Foster's "Camptown Races." Narrator Schickel read from Bach's letters complaining about the high cost of living in Leipzig.

P.D.Q. pumped the organ bellows as a lad, Schickel lectured the audience. "Many a Baroque youngster worked the bellows." To hisses at his puns, Schickel responded, "I can take a lot more of this than you can," and the concert rolled merrily forward.

"Canzon per sonar a se! — count them — se!"

was performed by two trumpeters, two horn players, a trombonist and a tuba player from the Philharmonic. This protest, Schickel said, that P.D.Q. could get the same extracurricular quality into music for ordinary instruments.

P.D.Q.'s "1712 Overture," "found" for the Boston Pops and premiered to thousands outdoors in Boston, received its New York premiere at the end of the Philharmonic concert. After the finale, in which percussionists stuck pins in balloons, a light flashed "Applause." The smiling audience readily obliged.

A platoon of Vietnam films heading for movie, TV viewing

NEW YORK — Hey, hey, LEI! More Hoys, more Charlies, M-16s, LZs, dragging claymores, Arlington barracks, hippie peaceboats. The explosive scenes of the 1967-75 Vietnam War are the subject of a new wave of consciousness for the 1980s that have only begun to be heard again on America's movie and television screens.

The \$10-million best-office success of "Platoon," which won the Academy Award for best picture of 1986 and is still playing in 1,500 U.S. theaters, has encouraged Hollywood to rush forth other films on Vietnam. The first of these, "Gardens of Stone," is in production long before "Platoon" writer-director Stone turned his wartime memories into a mass phenomenon.

"Full Metal Jacket," opening in June, might have been out first if Kubrick had not kept shooting for a full year and lingered over the editing in London. Kubrick, who refuses to fly, used an industrial lot in London's East End as his combat location, with the aid of some planted palm trees and special effects. Still, the budget escalated to a reported \$27 million.

And television, always moving quickly whenever a profitable trend becomes obvious, soon will night-ambush viewers with TV movies, series, pilots and documentaries on the long-painful subject.

"Maybe Vietnam has changed more than the peas of it all is not quite as fresh and threatening in everybody's mind," explained Stephen Randall, executive vice president of marketing at New York-based Michael J. Fox. "Gardens of Stone" was supposed to be released this fall, but Tri-Star quickly rescheduled it for a national break-out next weekend when "Platoon" proved such a hit.

Still more scripts are sure to make the Vietnam movie almost a genre of its own, like the western. Bangkok, Thailand, this week was playing the role of Saigon for crews from 20th Century-Fox and Disney's Touchstone Films.

"Good Morning, Vietnam," starring Robin Williams as a brass Army Forces Radio disc jockey in 1965 Saigon, will test whether the United States is ready not only to think about the war but to laugh about it too. "This film is much more in the realm of 'MASH' than it is in the realm of 'Platoon,'" said Disney spokesman Dan Sheffery.

Not everyone connected with the new Vietnam cycle is optimistic about its commercial potential. Cannon Films released Lionel Chetwynd's POW story, "The Hanoi Hilton," last month in an extremely poor initial reception. Columbia Pictures recently dropped plans to film "Home Before Morning," Sally Field's project starring herself as an Army nurse in Nam.

Nicholas Proffitt, the former Army sergeant and Newsweek Vietnam correspondent who wrote the novel "Gardens of Stone," is concerned that "Platoon" may actually

the business prospects of subsequent Vietnam pictures. "People may think that they have now seen the definitive Vietnam film — which is nonsense," said Proffitt. "I would not be making straight combat stories set in Vietnam right now. 'Platoon's' done it and people are not going to see them, I would think."

Sure, said Proffitt, Kubrick's combat film (based on Gustav Hasford's violent novel "The Short-Timers") may turn out to be a work of genius. "But what's the most he can do — win an Academy Award? It's already been done."

By contrast, Ronald Bass' screenplay for "Gardens of Stone," excised the combat episodes in Proffitt's book. Coppola makes effective use of TV-news combat footage, but the emotionally wrenching movie is set mostly in Arlington National Cemetery among the soldiers of the Old Guard, the precision ceremonial unit that buried 15 war dead a day.

Cann plays a frustrated career noncom who falls in love with a liberal Washington Post reporter played by Anjelica Huston, acts as father substitute to a glory-seeking recruit (D.B. Sweeney) and is comforted by the friendship of an all-accepting (old sergeant, played by James Earl Jones. "Gardens of Stone" reflects the widespread cooling of passions since "Apocalypse Now." To win the necessary Pentagon cooperation at Arlington, Coppola walked a tightrope in downplaying some of the novel's critical elements. "The Army was looking to have its own 'Top Gun,'" said Proffitt.

Kubrick has not allowed Warner Bros. to embrace "Full Metal Jacket." The story starts with a clip so far, but some who've seen the footage discuss an atmosphere reminiscent of Kubrick's "Dr. Strangelove."

'Success' reigns supreme in box office earnings

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — "The Secret of My Success" lived up to its name for a fourth week in the box office sweepstakes, but figures released Tuesday show the bridge to New York is still "scared" up more bucks per screen.

Although the "Creedshaw" sequel managed to exceed the reigning box office champ in Los Angeles and New York theaters, Michael J. Fox's "The Secret of My Success" continued to win friends and influence people nationwide.

Movieweek checked out \$4.6 million to the top picture, showing on 1,333 screens for a \$4,151 per-screen average. The four-week portfolio for "The Secret of My Success" is \$33.3 million.

"Copenhagen 2" had an impressive \$3.6 million take in its first week of release on only 867 screens for a \$4,134 per-screen average.

The returns fell the first weekend in May were ahead of the same period last year, continuing the box office rout of 1987. The top films this week alone grossed 20 percent more than the leading titles last year.

They were also enjoying the rigors of studios and theater owners because late spring movie business is usually sluggish until the summer blockbusters hit the screens.

But the week's figures were disappointing for Fox's two new motion pictures featuring a former box-office champ and another "Family Ties" actor hoping to cash in on his small-screen appeal.

"Malone" had a dreary debut, placing 18th with a \$1.3 million turnout like, and "My Demon Lover," featuring the big screen debut of Scott Wolfstone, the goods boyfriend on "Family Ties," was No. 13 for a 10-day total of only \$3.3 million.

TV's "Moonlighting" star Bruce Willis attracted \$2.5 million in ticket sales in his first five days, "Blind Date," which jumped from fourth place to third in its sixth week for a total gross of \$33.9 million.

Dropping from second to fourth was "Extreme Prejudice," the riotous action yarn directed by Walter Hill and starring Nick Nolte as a hardened Texas Ranger battling drug smugglers. The movie rang up \$2.1 million in ticket sales.

Slipping from third to fifth was "Project X," which stars Matthew



Gossett continues demanding career in a CBS racial drama

By LYNN HOOGENBOOM

The turning point in actor Louis Gossett Jr.'s career came in 1976 when he starred on Broadway in "The River Niger." "I shaved my head for the part, then let a little hair grow back," Gossett recalls. "After the play was over, I shaved it all off so it would grow back even."

That might have been the end of it if his agent hadn't seen him with his new bald look. "My agent said, 'Wait a minute. Wait a minute. We have something here,'" says Gossett with a big, booming laugh. On his agent's orders, Gossett continued to apply the razor, and something amazing happened. "I got all these parts."

The reason, as far as Gossett can figure, was that seeing him without hair allowed those who make the casting decisions to imagine him in all kinds of trappings. "The makeup people were happy because they could form anything they wanted to," says Gossett. "And I got to play a variety of roles."

The roles have included an Oscar-winning outing (for Best Actor in a Supporting Role) as Sgt. Foley in "An Officer and a Gentleman" (1982) and an Emmy-winning outing as Fiddler in "Roots" (1977). His latest effort is "A Gathering of Old Men," which airs Sunday, May 10, on CBS. Gossett plays Mathu, a proud, 74-year-old black man who is suspected of killing a menacing white racist. "I'm the youngest guy in the company playing the oldest," says the 50-year-old Gossett.

Mathu discovers that he has more friends than he thought when 18 other old black men individually confess to the killing. Sheriff Mapes (played by Richard Widmark) is positive that Mathu is the only one among them who would have had the nerve to do the job, but he faces a tough job proving it.

"The racial incident is the catalyst," says Gossett, "but it's really not about that. It's about friendship and love. It'll surprise you."

Gossett considers "A Gathering of Old Men" a first-rate drama, but he admits that he hasn't gotten where he is today by being overly picky about the roles he takes. "I'll take any kind of role, as long as I can do something with it," he says. "I started taking roles in films that

didn't look like they were going to be very good, but the roles were sooooo good. Then you get a chance to — as the old actors say — eat up the wallpaper. But if you're fortunate enough to have a combination of a good part, good script, good director and good actors, then you're in seventh heaven."

Gossett grew up in Brooklyn, N.Y., far from the back country of Louisiana, where "A Gathering of Old Men" takes place, but he has a good idea what it was like for a 74-year-old black man who grew up in the South.

"I was in the South every summer — in Georgia," he recalls. "I stayed with my great aunt, worked on the farm and helped feed the hogs and mules."

It was quite a jump from the streets of Brooklyn to the Georgia countryside.

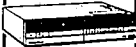

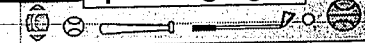

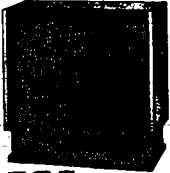

The first group went to the Soviet Union on May 4 for a week, and two other groups will follow. The two-hour, first-person style documentary will be broadcast in June, CBS said.

Roger Moore looks at 25 years of James Bond in ABC special

LOS ANGELES—Roger Moore says when he was making seven James Bond pictures, he was convinced the producer and directors were out to kill him.

Moore, tongue in cheek, recounted going through explosions and fire, dangling from helicopters and cable cars, riding the tails of airplanes and blasting into space—all in the cause of being Agent 007.

"I thought they wanted to kill me and collect the insurance," he said.

"I was always suspicious about what people were up to. Did you see those explosions? Did you see what they did to me?"

Moore made his debut in 1973 in "Live and Let Die," as Britain's suave, sexy and skillful secret agent. His last Bond film was "A View to a Kill" in 1985. On May 13, ABC takes a look at Bond, the creation of author Ian Fleming, and the ultimate secret agent's various incarnations on the screen. The special is called "Happy Anniversary 007—25 Years of James Bond." Mel Stuart produced it, and film critic and historian Richard Schickel wrote it.

Sean Connery was the first Bond in "Dr. No" in 1962. He made the next five James Bond pictures and returned—in 1983—for "Never Say Never Again." George Lazenby followed Connery as Bond for one picture, "On Her Majesty's Secret Service" in 1969. Then Moore took over.

The newest Bond is Timothy Dalton, who has just completed "The Living Daylights."

The special deals only with the Bond movies produced by Albert R. "Cubby" Broccoli, so "Never Say Never Again" is not included.

The Bond movies were known for their fanciful technology and spectacular stunts.

"Was I frightened?" Moore asked rhetorically. "Of course not, I was James Bond. Actually, I was terrified witless, but I was such a good actor, I looked like I was enjoying it."

"I loathe heights," he said. "The cable car on Sugar Loaf Mountain in Brazil was terrifying. On one film, I had to cling to the side of a mountain. My feet froze. They gave me a lot of Valium. It's terrible when you're afraid of heights. Working on the Eiffel Tower, I had to jump on top of the elevator. There you had railings nearby, but on a cliff you have nothing."

"On 'Moonraker,' I had to follow this girl at the Iguacu Falls in Brazil. It was very wet, and the spray was blowing all over. I kept telling the director I was going to

fall over. He said they'd put a rope on me."

Moore filmed segments for the special in France and Switzerland, wearing some of the wardrobe from the movies and returning to some of the same sites. "We did it so that when I introduce a clip you're not really sure whether it's a part of the film or not," he said.

"Richard Schickel wrote some good dialogue, which I wish I could do justice to. I say more in the special than I ever did in all the Bond films."

The special features great moments from Bond movies and a look at those incredible villains, from Dr. No to Koscov, the bizarre accomplices, from Rosa Klebb to May Day, and the Bond women, from Honeychile Rider to Octopussy. There is also the Bond music. Songs from Bond films were nominated three times for Academy Awards, though none ever won.

Moore had been on television in "Maverick" and "The Saint." The first time he was set to do a Bond film, it was scrubbed because of war in Cambodia, where it was to have been filmed. He signed to do the short-lived ABC series "The Persuaders" with Tony Curtis instead, and the Bond film went to Lazenby. In his 12 years as Bond, Moore worked on location in India, Egypt, Sardinia, Italy, France, the United States, Greece, Iceland, Switzerland, Brazil, England, Thailand, Hong Kong, Jamaica and the Bahamas.

"It was hard work, particularly places like Egypt or Italy," he said. "Bond always wore a bloody dinner jacket while everyone else had an open shirt."
