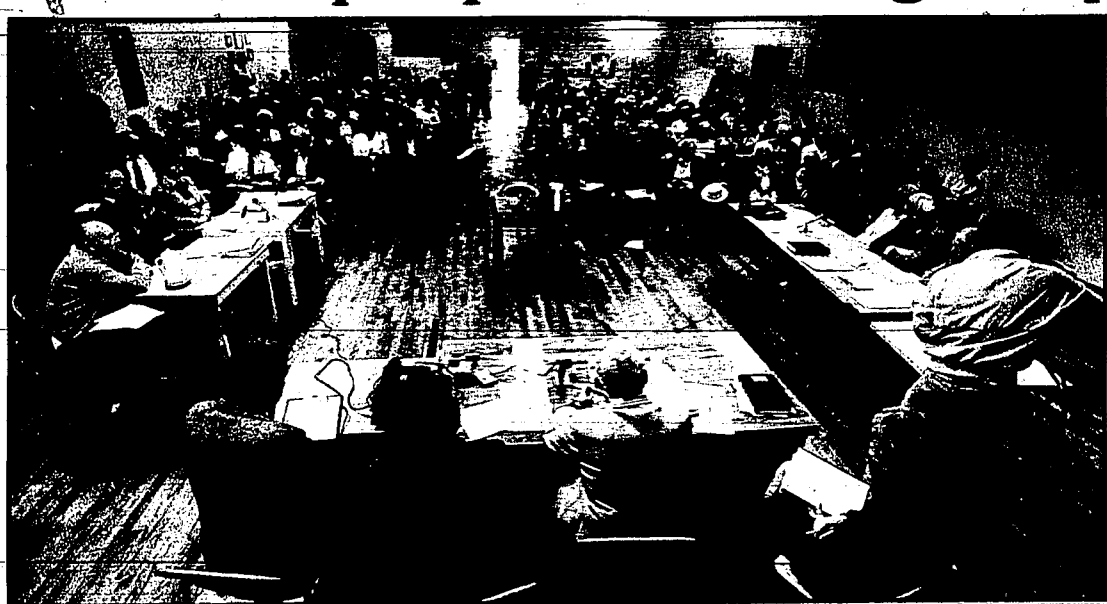

Trout firm postpones water right requests



Action before
hearing angers
protest leader

GOODING — Rim View Trout Co. postponed its water rights requests at Niagara Springs on technical grounds Thursday, angering protester Bob Burks.

He said many of the 70 people in the audience at a Department of Water Resources hearing here came out to support his opposition to the filings.

State Department of Water Resources Director A. Kenneth Dunn overruled Burks' objections to the withdrawal and agreed to Rim View owner Earl Hardy's request for a postponement. Rim View wants 250 cubic feet per second at Niagara Springs.

"I worked my butt off trying to get people aroused. If this is continued, I lose some of my clout. I don't think it is fair to the public to allow them to extend," said Burks, a former dairy farmer from Wendell.

William Ringert, Hardy's attorney, said during a recess at the Gooding Grange hearing that the reason for the postponement was technical.

"We're withdrawing from consideration today because DWR indicated once the filings go into the permit stage, they can't be restored to appeal status."

Ringert, a state senator from Boise, says he wants to come up with a way of making the filings which will keep the rights of appeal and protest intact no matter how Dunn rules.

Dunn indicated to us this morning that he was not treating this the way we thought," said Ringert.

Asked if the reason for postponing the filings was to wait for public opposition to die down, Ringert said the opposition could still come forward. He reiterated that a reason for the postponement was to preserve Rim View's protest rights.

The postponement was a temporary retreat in a chess game involving Hardy, Burks and Idaho Power Co.

The stakes as Burks sees them are the preservation of Niagara Springs as a series of water flows that tumble

Public favors minimum flow at Niagara Springs

GOODING — Public comment was overwhelmingly in favor of a minimum stream flow at Niagara Springs during a state Department of Water Resources hearing here Thursday night.

"I strongly urge that not one additional gallon of water be diverted from Niagara Springs," said Robert S. Lunney, a fish farmer north of Boise.

He said he supported the application by the state Parks and Recreation Department for a minimum flow of 262 cubic feet per second from the springs to a point to be determined by DWR.

Lunney said "developments have chipped away at our massively attacked and were once beautiful natural water resources until at present there is almost nothing left in its natural state."

Rim View Trout Co., owned by Earl Hardy of Boise, has filed for 295.3 cfs of diversions at the springs south of Wendell. Rim View is already entitled to 140.3 cfs at the springs.

The Rim View filings were not at issue at Thursday night's hearing at the Gooding Grange Hall but will be brought up at a later date to be determined by DWR. Niagara has a historic flow of 260 cfs, a figure which Hardy disputes. If the Rim View filings were approved, the creek below the springs would receive 50 cfs, an amount some Wendell residents

judge inadequate to preserve the beauty of the creek.

State Sen. Laird Noh, R-Kimberly, and Rep. Ben Black, R-Twin Falls, both testified in support of the Parks and Recreation application at Niagara.

Noh said the public interest has shifted strongly in favor of protecting natural free flowing water and water quality for public uses.

Noh urged DWR to protect the local public interest from the headwaters of the springs to Fugate Park which is adjacent to a fish farm operated by Rim View and an Idaho Power Co. steelhead hatchery.

"Failure to do so would seriously shock public expectations," he said.

The grange hall was packed with more than 100 people. More than 70 people attended in the morning and afternoon.

Bill Chisholm of DWR urged DWR to allow no additional waters to be diverted for commercial use.

"Too often we see public interest take a back seat to some rich developer who takes money out of the area and doesn't live there," Chisholm said.

Larry Anderson of Eden, father of the state senator, said last year he took 1,200 people staying at his campground on scenic tours of the area and one of the stops was Niagara Springs. He said these tours have received international publicity and maintaining a quality

Administration postpones plan to protect Kuwaiti tankers

WASHINGTON — With congressional alarm rising, the Reagan administration has put off for several weeks its plan to extend American military protection to Kuwaiti oil tankers in the Persian Gulf, Pentagon officials and a key senator said Thursday.

The plan had raised concerns in Congress that it could draw the United States into the Iran-Iraq war. To dampen these concerns, the administration sent Defense Secretary Caspar W. Weinberger and national security

adviser Frank Carlucci to Capitol Hill for a closed briefing with key figures.

Iran's ambassador to the United Nations, Said Rajala-Khorassani, in a television interview, said the United States is "looking for trouble" by stepping up its military presence in the Gulf.

Secretary of State George P. Shultz, talking to reporters in his office Thursday evening, said the "the United States has no intention and will not get directly involved in the Iran-Iraq war. We will not go to war with either party."

At the same time, Shultz said, "If our ships get attacked anywhere, we will defend ourselves — that's not going to war with anybody."

After hearing from Weinberger and Carlucci, the chairman of the Senate Armed Forces Committee, Sen. Sam Nunn, D-Ga., said, "I have mixed feelings about whether

hostilities are imminent. Certainly hostilities are possible, certainly we're taking on a new mission in the area."

Nunn also confirmed that the move to protect Kuwaiti tankers had been delayed.

Congressional leaders said they would measure next week, requiring a detailed report from the administration about its future policy and military moves in the Persian Gulf, through which passes much of the West's oil supply.

Initially, White House and Pentagon officials said the plan to put American cap-

tain and the American flag on Kuwaiti ships and to protect them with American forces would be put into effect within a week or two. They said the May 17 Iraqi attack on the USS Stark, which killed 37 American sailors, would have no impact on the decision.

Pentagon officials, speaking on condition they not be identified, said reflagging the Kuwaiti vessels — largely a paperwork process — would not fly over those ships until the Navy

Senate delays penalties for employers of aliens

WASHINGTON — The Senate voted for the second time in a week Thursday to delay until Oct. 1 sanctions against employers who knowingly hire illegal aliens under the new federal immigration law.

The provision for the delay, approved by a 47-43 vote, is attached to a \$9.4 billion stopgap spending bill, which could pass Friday. Thursday's vote was requested by opponents of the delay, led by Sen. Alan K. Simpson, R-Wyo., who tried to muster more support for their side since last week's 48-45 vote on the same issue.

The Senate provision is expected to face strong opposition from the House, which has passed its own version of the spending bill with no sanctions delay attached. The disparity between the two bills will have to be worked out in a House-Senate conference committee.

Senators were lobbied heavily for the delay by a coalition of civil rights groups and business organizations, who argued that beginning the sanctions program June 1, as scheduled, would cause "chaos" because of delays in the Immigration and Naturalization Service's public information program.

The INS had planned to mail millions of

booklets explaining the new law this month, but officials now concede that the material will not be ready to mail until mid-June at the earliest. Last week, on the same day of the first Senate vote, the INS agreed to a one-month delay of sanctions.

During Senate debate, however, supporters of the four-month delay argued that the INS postponement was not enough. "I want this program to work," Sen. Barbara Mikulski, D-Md., said, adding that the INS public information program offered "bureaucratic bumbling, continual chaos and excuses instead of action."

Falwell says it's time to end 'soap opera'

FORT MILL, S.C. — The Rev. Jerry Falwell said Thursday that it was time to halt the bickering that has made the PTL ministry sound like a "soap opera" and to concentrate on saving the ministry, in debt \$70 million.

Compared with news coverage of the PTL problems, "the Iran-Contra situation is almost lost on back-page," Falwell said Thursday on the "PTL Club" program.

"I have an idea that Oliver North and President Reagan might be a little happy about these terrible headlines and these awful news stories about the situation here," Falwell said.

On Thursday, the story was the exchange of barbs between Falwell and disgraced evangelist Jim Bakker, who in March turned the 518,000-member ministry over to Falwell and admitted a sexual encounter in 1986 with a church secretary from New York.

"The Assemblies of God stripped Bakker of his pastoring, citing allegations of sexual misconduct including claims that Bakker had engaged in homosexual activity — allegations Bakker repeatedly has denied."

Falwell on Wednesday said he had talked face-to-face with men who said Bakker had made advances toward them.

"Obviously, I would not have said what I said yesterday without evidence," including taped and sworn statements, Falwell said Thursday on "Good Morning America."

Along with the sex scandal, a financial crisis materialized soon after Bakker's departure. Falwell said Thursday that PTL was \$70 million in debt but that he had raised more than \$5.2 million of the \$7 million it needed to pay bills due June 1.

Ex-envoy quotes North orders to aid Contras

WASHINGTON — Former U.S. Ambassador Lewis A. Tamba testified Thursday that in 1985, while U.S. aid to Nicaraguan Contra rebels was banned, White House aide Oliver L. North ordered him to use his wife, in Costa Rica, to help the rebels open a military front in Nicaragua.

"Mr. North was working for the National Security Council and obviously my assumption was that any instruction he gave me came from his superiors," Tamba said in

responding to a question at the Iran-Contra hearings about why he followed orders from the Marine lieutenant colonel.

Tamba also said he was asked by North to help private efforts to resupply the Contras.

Earlier in the day, former CIA operative Felix I. Rodriguez told the House-Senate hearings that he broke with the clandestine resupply operation for the rebels — run by North — after becoming disgusted with overcharges, bribery and deliveries of unreliable ammunition.

After Rodriguez completed his testimony, one of the legislators probing the affair referred to the managers North recruited for the supply network as "battering rams," adding to the debate over whether those aiding the rebels were patriots or profiteers.

Also Thursday, the committees voted to conduct a closed-door session on Friday with Joe Fernandez, the former CIA station chief in Costa Rica who was known as Tomas Castillo. Fernandez left the agency after being disciplined for helping

the Contra support effort during the congressional ban.

Tamba, who was ambassador to Costa Rica from 1985 until last January and is now a history professor at Arizona State University, gave the committees the first direct evidence of a State Department official helping the rebels during the two-year congressional ban on U.S. military aid to the Contras.

Gang nabs British diplomat

LONDON (AP) — A gang of armed men abducted a British diplomat in Iran Thursday afternoon after forcing his car to stop on a highway in Tehran, the Foreign Office said.

Edward Chapman, first secretary at the British interests section at the Swedish Embassy in Tehran and Britain's No. 2 diplomat in Iran, was driving along a highway "when his car was forced to stop by another car, and he was forcibly taken away," a ministry spokesman said.

Chapman was traveling with his wife, Nicola, and their baby son, who were left alone and unharmed, said the spokesman, who spoke on condition his name was not disclosed.

The abduction occurred at about 4:20 p.m. Iran time (7 a.m. EDT), the spokesman said.

No group has claimed responsibility, he said.

There was no immediate comment from Iran.

The British government has "expressed 'its grave concern' to the Iranian government and the Iranian chargé d'affaires in London and 'have sought their assurance in having him (Chapman) released immediately,'" the Foreign Office spokesman said.

Plane buzzes Lenin tomb, then lands in Red Square

MOSCOW (AP) — A single-engine plane buzzed Lenin's mausoleum before landing at Red Square Thursday night, shocking more than 200 onlookers and a handful of militiamen and Kremlin guards, a witness said.

The plane's pilot, who told the crowd he was an engineer from West Germany, managed to signal a few autographs before being arrested along with his female companion, the witness said.

The white plane, which appeared to be a U.S.-made Cessna, had circled the square three times and swooped over the mausoleum where Lenin is entombed before landing at about 7:30 p.m., said the witness, who requested anonymity.

"It flew within about a meter (yard) of the mausoleum," the witness said. "After it landed, people ran everywhere. They didn't know what happened."

"After a few minutes, they got out of the plane and everyone crowded around at first," he said.

"The pilot started handing out papers to people with his signature," said the witness, who did not manage to get the pilot's name.

Militiamen quickly dispersed the crowd.

from the south canyon wall and flow into a sparkling creek used for fishing and swimming. Hardy, who operates a fish farm adjacent to the springs, says he needs more water to expand his operation and the amount left for the creek will be adequate.

Hardy concluded an agreement with IPC to give up priority rights on his fillings to allow IPC to use more water. The utility needs to boost steelhead production at its hatchery next to Hardy's trout farm. This is a federal requirement to rake up for damage to fishery from the company's dams along the Snake.

IPC agreed to Hardy's withdrawal of the fillings, said Bob Stahman, IPC attorney.

Currently, Rim View is entitled to 140.3 cfs at Niagara Springs and IPC to 132 cfs, according to DWR. Hardy

says Rim View's existing use returns water to the Snake but not Niagara Springs Creek.

But under the arrangement IPC does return water to the creek after it is used in its steelhead hatchery. If Rim View's fillings are approved 50 cfs would be returned to the creek, says Hardy.

DWR held state Parks and Recreation Department's filing for 254 cfs from the head of the springs to the point to be determined by DWR.

Initially, Hardy opposed this filing but after conferring with Rinda Jay Just, deputy attorney general for parks and recreation, he agreed to withdraw the protest.

Parks and Recreation has agreed to allow Rim View to install a water diversion pipe carrying 5.15 cfs near the walkway by the canyon wall.

This would be done under one of Rim View's existing licenses. The

plans and specifications for the pipe would require parks and recreation approval, according to the agreement. The pipe would be installed and the site rehabilitated from construction so that any change in the appearance of the site would be virtually unnoticeable, according to the agreement. The parks and recreation department agreed not to build up against the pipe after lunch, half the audience was gone. Bakker said Wednesday in an appearance with his wife, Tammy Faye, on ABC's "Nightline" that if Falwell would not let him return to the PTL center, he may start a new ministry in California.

"I believe in miracles and I would like to have my ministry back if the people want us back," Bakker said.

"Jerry Falwell won't let us go home. I dream of building another city, maybe in California."

"We have already picked about a 25-person board of the greatest leaders in this country that we

would submit ourselves to. We also would like to have our partners actually vote by an outside accounting firm what our salaries should be and even what kind of car we drive. And we're willing to submit to that."

The Bakkers had been scheduled to appear on "Larry King Live" on Cable News Network on Thursday night, but King told viewers at the beginning of the program that the Bakkers had canceled their appearance.

Falwell said the couple was paid \$1.9 million last year, not including bonuses and other benefits.

Court orders repayment

BOISE (AP) — A jobless worker must repay \$3,287 in unemployment compensation because he did not keep proper records of job contacts, the Idaho Supreme Court says.

In a 4-1 ruling released Thursday, the court upheld an Industrial Commission ruling that Robert L. Burnside must repay jobless benefits he received in late 1984 and early 1985.

Justice Stephen Bistline dissented, saying there was no authority in state law for the Department of Employment to demand repayment of improper benefits. The agency can only file civil action or withhold the money from future payments, Bistline said.

Company challenges claim

BOISE (AP) — A North Carolina insurance company wants U.S. District Court to rule that it does not have to defend Owyhee County Prosecutor Clayton Andersen in a lawsuit over mining claims Andersen filed on the site of a hazardous waste disposal site.

Globe Indemnity Co., headquartered at Charlotte, said in a lawsuit filed Thursday it has issued a homeowners insurance policy to Andersen. Andersen has asked the company to defend him in a lawsuit filed by EnviroSAFE Services of Idaho, Inc.

Andersen and Charles Scott, county environmental officer, filed placer mining claims on much of the site near Grand View used by EnviroSAFE for hazardous waste disposal.

Trustees ratify contract

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Bonneville School District trustees have ratified a 1987-88 contract with teachers that includes an average 10.5 percent salary increase, one of the largest awarded in the state this year.

The increase is one of the largest awarded to district teachers in recent years. Last year, salaries were frozen except for increases for teachers with more experience or education. In 1985, teachers received a 3.9 percent increase.

The board ratified the contract Thursday, after the district and EBBA reached a tentative agreement May 16. The union ratified the contract Tuesday.

The salary base for teachers will increase from \$14,394 to \$15,380, and teachers will be able to accumulate 100 days of sick leave, an increase of 10 days.

State agencies' rent rises

BOISE (AP) — State agencies have been notified by the Department of Administration that the rent goes up 6 percent, starting July 1.

Director Loren Nelson has sent a letter to all state agencies, making an increase in the charge for utilities, repairs, security, insurance and maintenance.

Class A space now costs \$6.50 per square foot but will be \$9 as of July 1. Class B space, now \$7.25, goes to \$7.65 and storage space goes from \$5.50 per foot to \$5.80.

No problems with aircraft

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — There appeared to be no mechanical problems with the light airplane that crashed near Cody, Wyo., on May 20, claiming the lives of three Idaho Falls men, investigators have concluded.

Investigators are that pilot John Chaffin, 49, might have lost control of the Piper Cherokee II, which crashed during a visual approach to the Cody airport, said Greg Felth, air safety investigator for the National Transportation Safety Board.

The crash killed Chaffin, Steve Burgraf, 37, and Gary Cain, 41. "It's hard to tell right now, but various elements indicate the pilot may have lost control," Felth said.

Soviet lawyers to visit Boise

BOISE (AP) — A high-ranking delegation of Soviet lawyers, including the Russian Minister of Justice, Alexander Sukharev, is scheduled to attend the summer meeting of the National Association of Attorneys General in Coeur d'Alene June 9.

Attorney General Jim Jones said Sukharev, who is president of the Association of Soviet Lawyers, will address the group.

Boise attorney Eugene Thomas, who is president of the American Bar Association, will serve as host for the five-member Soviet delegation, Jones said. Thomas also will address the gathering June 9, Jones said.

Board wants more information

ST. ANTHONY (AP) — The Idaho Water Resources Board says it needs more information before it gets involved in an irrigation dispute between farmers in this area.

At a water board meeting here on Wednesday, the discussion centered on irrigation practices in Fremont County's Egin Bench area, and its impact on downstream water users.

The board called for a new study on the sub-irrigation system. Board chairman Gene Gray also asked for copies of earlier reports by the Bureau of Reclamation and U.S. Geological Survey.

PUC plans cogeneration policy review

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Public Utilities Commission plans to take another look at whether its "avoided cost" policy for cogenerators, adopted in a period of soaring electricity demand, should be kept.

Idaho's utilities have been asked to respond by July 31 to a request to review the state's cogeneration policy.

Under a federal law, Idaho and

other states adopted policies in 1981 designed to encourage cogeneration. Cogeneration is the production of small amounts of electricity, usually as a byproduct of other operations. In Idaho, a common method is using the sawdust from sawmills to fire steam plants generating electricity.

The state's regulated utilities must sign contracts to buy the power with cogenerators, based on

the "avoided cost" theory. Theoretically, the utility can avoid the expense of building new generating facilities by purchasing power from secondary producers.

The rates for those "avoided costs" and the fact that utilities are forced to sign involuntary agreements with high-cost power producers, even if they don't need the power, have produced a series of lawsuits since the policy was adopted in 1981.

Idaho Power Co., the state's largest electrical utility, has signed contracts with six cogenerators actually hooked up to the Idaho Power system and producing electricity. Idaho Power spokesman Larry Taylor said.

The PUC said it has several major goals for the investigation:

- Prices should be set to maximize benefits to society. Cogeneration power purchases should not increase ratepayer costs or decrease system reliability and safety.

- The state's policy should be as simple as possible to avoid conflicts and allow developers, utilities and consumers to make appropriate production and consumption decisions.

- Investment risks and rewards should be matched. "The price structure should competitively

compensate those who accept the risks of development and should guarantee the development of cogeneration power as required by federal law," the PUC said.

The price structure should allow utilities to incorporate both its own generation capacity and that of cogenerators into long-term planning. The present system of basing rates on the cost of a hypothetical plant, which may never be built, may be inaccurate, the PUC said.

Idaho's hydroelectric capacity, wind waste and geothermal resources require specific treatment.

Rhoades to face trial in Idaho Falls deaths

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Paul Ezra Rhoades will face first-degree murder charges in 7th District Court in the deaths of teacher Susan Michelbacher and convenience store clerk Nolan Haddon, Bonneville County Magistrate Michael Kennedy ruled late Thursday afternoon.

Kennedy also found the 30-year-old Idaho Falls man over on 11 other charges stemming from the slayings. The decision capped a three-day preliminary hearing that had been expected to last through the middle of next week.

Haddon, 20, of Blackfoot, was found wounded in the walk-in cooler of the Idaho Falls convenience store where he worked on March 17. He died a few hours later at an Idaho Falls hospital.

Mrs. Michelbacher, who taught special education at Idaho Falls' Eagle Rock Junior High, disappeared March 19 from a supermarket parking lot. Her body was found March 21 outside the city.

Testimony presented at the preliminary hearing showed that she had been raped and sexually abused.

Rhoades will enter a plea to the charges before a district court judge. Depending on his plea, he will be sentenced or go to trial. He also faces first-degree murder and other charges in Blaine County for the late-February slaying of Blackfoot convenience store clerk Stacy Baldwin.

In testimony Thursday, two people identified Rhoades' first cousin as a man they saw riding in Mrs. Michelbacher's van the day she disappeared.

But Harry Burke, the man two people picked out of a photographic lineup, testified at Rhoades' hearing that he never rode in the vehicle.

Earlier, Idaho State Police dispatcher Susan Browning, who lived west of Idaho Falls, identified Rhoades as the person driving Mrs. Michelbacher's van when it stalled at the end of her driveway on the day the teacher disappeared.

Mrs. Browning said a second man and a woman walked around the back of the van while it was stopped. She identified the second man from a lineup of photographs, and the defense and prosecutor agreed the photograph was of Burke.

Thomas Moss, Bingham County prosecutor and a special deputy prosecutor in the case, said two people who did not know Burke picked him from six photographs.

Pocatello selects areas for growth

POCATELLO (AP) — The Greater Pocatello Chamber of Commerce has tentatively targeted food processing, health-related businesses, fiber optics communication and the Pebble Creek ski resort as the city's four most promising areas of economic growth.

The strategy committee of the chamber's Economic Growth Council (EGC) has also identified the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory, Gould Semiconductors, the P&M and J.R. Simplot Co. phosphate plants, and the city's transportation-warehousing system as vital sectors to keep, maintain and expand.

As it proceeds through an economic development plan prepared by a consulting company, the chamber has assigned study teams to address those issues at the strategy committee's next session June 15, said Chamber President Dick Conroy.

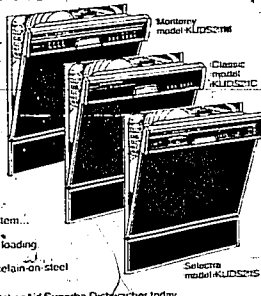

Basics for progress being taken seriously

From Twin Falls and Boise this week come two messages about what Idaho can do to build a diversified economic base which will both fuel the state's growth and preserve its scenic beauty.

The first, in Twin Falls, was from two local entrepreneurs who aren't waiting for someone else to develop foreign markets for Idaho and Magic Valley goods.

David Steadman and Mark Stubbs have been hard at work developing contacts in foreign countries for a range of Magic Valley products. Some of their efforts are starting to sprout in inquiries from specific countries.

The message here is that it's all well and good to talk about economic growth and developing foreign markets, but at some point, the talk has to be supplanted by action. And that comes, mostly, at the entrepreneurial level and through non-governmental activity.

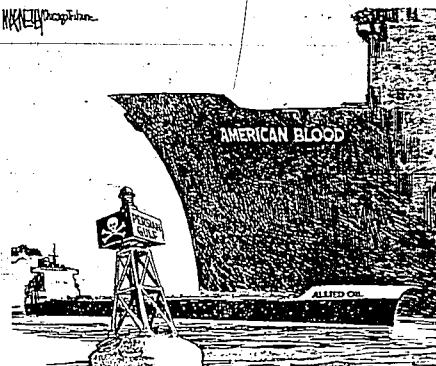
The second message comes out of an economic development conference in Boise this week and from comments at that conference by both New Hampshire Gov. John Sununu and former Secretary of Education Terrel Bell, a native Idahoan.

Both men emphasized that investment in Idaho's education system is essential to moving the state forward. Sununu, whose state has enjoyed exceptional growth, talked about how that growth came about.

Location — close to Boston — has had something to do with it. But so does investment in education and tourism. Idaho, he said, should build on these essential elements.

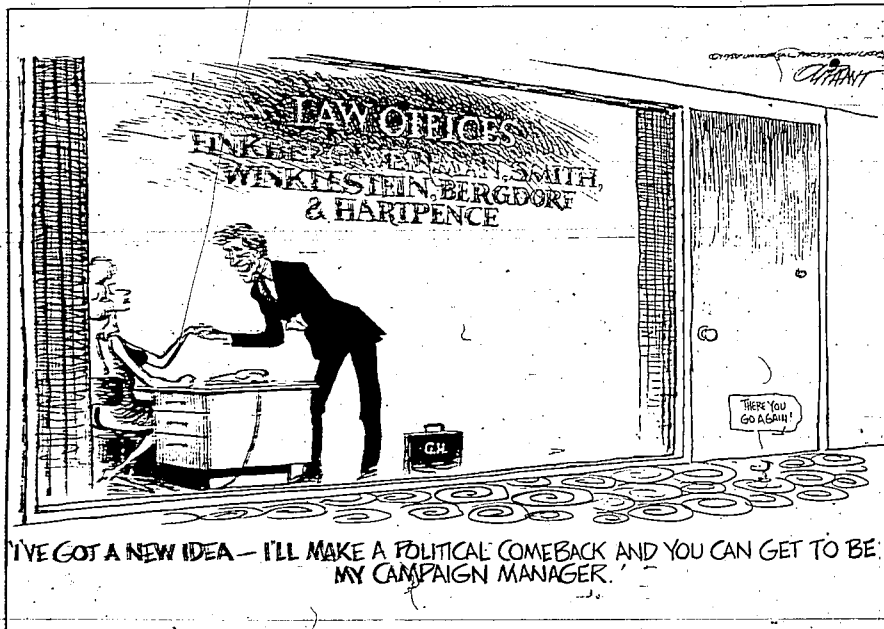
Bell focused more on education. In our view, he was soft on his native state, gently saying Idaho still had improvements to make in educational quality. First among them, in our view, is accountability for what school districts and teachers are teaching.

In the past year or so, a consensus has been building in Idaho that both entrepreneurial spirit and investment in education are key ingredients for Idaho's progress. This week's comments show that both are being taken seriously.

Right of privacy should be protected

The right of privacy is as important to our liberty as any freedom granted us by the Bill of Rights.

The Miami Herald's shabby and intrusive coverage of Gary Hart's private life and Bay's subsequent withdrawal as the leading Democratic presidential candidate have led me to reevaluate the importance of the Fourth Amendment's protection of a person's "reasonable expectation of privacy" in the home.

Until this issue arose, I was fond of saying that the First Amendment is the cornerstone of the freedom of speech and the freedom to know is the cornerstone to all our rights. I just think that the right of privacy should be protected.

The home may be the greatest single influence upon each of us. It helps determine, to a great degree, who we are as individuals. I speak not only of the home as a place where we are raised, but also the domestic atmosphere for ourselves and those we love.

All of us know that we have a public side which we share at work, when we shop, when we are out in the community. The public side of an individual is a much easier entity than the whole individual. We must not confuse the public person with the fully human personality, or pretend that the public identity is all we need. We should not pretend that one's public identity must be in perfect congruence with one's private identity.

Home is the sanctuary where we may let down our guard and unfold ourselves to all our frailties and vulnerabilities, all our passions and dreams. We may find that the television news broadcasts, campaign ads and even cover our

bosses and our leaders. A citizen may say things privately that in public life or at his job, he dare not, or jeopardize his livelihood.

Home is where you are free from the pressure to be a clone of your neighbor or your neighbor's values, free from the pressure to be simply what the community or government says you should be.

Your home allows you the privacy to read what you like, say what you like, dream and plan as you like, and act the way you wish as long as you don't violate the basic rights of others. You may read and thoughtfully consider Karl Marx's Das Kapital, or heaven forbid, Thomas Paine's The Rights of Man. You may think as you wish and speak as you desire. And there should be no repercussions from society or from the government.

George Orwell in his masterpiece, 1984, wrote about a totalitarian government where the citizens did not have a "reasonable expectation of privacy" but rather the opposite, a reasonable expectation of constant surveillance. "Big Brother is watching you."

Great religious leaders sought the privacy of deserts or mountain tops to gather spiritual nourishment for the tasks that were ahead. Each of us takes intellectual and emotional nourishment in the privacy of our homes.

without malice or criminal intent shall not be liable for any claim which . . .

Fun, huh? Actually, after sitting in the law library the other day watching a young female attorney surrounded by books big enough to anchor a boat with so as to present a case which she could lose and straining like she was having a baby at some of the verbiage . . . Awesome!

To argue that public figures and presidential candidates must give up much of their privacy to suppress public interest, is to ask them to give up freedom, to give up being fully human, to give up the right of nourishment that all of us need.

Such an attitude ends up rewarding the shallow man, the man who is hollow and has little depth and little difference between his public identity and his private one. If anything, a leader needs more privacy and more of the sustenance that privacy can give, for a leader must give more.

The press should be a force for greater freedom, not less. We should be giving each person latitude to be uniquely himself or herself. We should not be panicking to either our own or the public's voyeuristic urges. When the right to know comes into conflict with an individual's right of privacy, there should be compelling evidence that the public needs to know, that the public interest would be served by violating that privacy. The test to decide whether or not to trespass upon the right of privacy should be severe, for what may be torn apart is that which makes us truly human — our private lives.

We cannot argue that we act for the public good in such disclosure, if we show little or no respect for an individual's good. The media's claim that presidential candidates can have little private domain is a pernicious one, and squeezes our sense of freedom in an unyielding vise.

We need to open the greedy jaws of the vise and let our freedoms go.

For a while, America's super-rich bought a foreign policy

BOSTON — If I had to choose just one thing to remember from the Iran-Contra mess, it wouldn't be the Swiss bank-account number.

It wouldn't even be the snow tires skimmed off the patriotic travelers checks. What I would choose to remember is how easily, how comfortably, how casually, a group of wealthy people in America purchased a private foreign policy.

The millionaires who testified last week weren't just the pigeons of those who can do fund-raisers, Ollie North and Carl Chammell. The trio of adventure capitalists — Ellen Garwood, William O'Boyle, Joseph Coors — regarded the chance to build a little niche army in Nicaragua like the chance to build a hospital wing in their hometown or a college library at their alma mater.

The fund-raisers presented them with a catalog of goodies to pick and choose from; everything from planes to boots, complete with price tag. A truly generous contributor might get a plaque on the plane bearing his or her name; the way hospital elevators pro-

claim their donor. The super-generous were even offered a chisel with the President. The only items missing from the catalog were mug shots of Contra targets with price tags so that donors could pick their own victims.

Was it not stirring how Ellen Garwood's heart and purse strings got plucked by the anxiety that supplies to the Contras would languish "much as supplies . . . to feed the starving people of Ethiopia . . . were left on the docks and rotted?"

But I don't want to remember these adventure capitalists and their charity as simply bizarre. In reality, they are not weirdos. They are, rather, the logical extension of the Reagan era's rule by the rich.

This era that began in 1980 when angry candidate Reagan demanded to get his way at the New Hampshire debate because "I paid for this microphone." From that day until the day of the new's testimony, there has been a single connecting ethic. You can do anything you want as long as you pay for it.

One of the precious things the rich can buy in America is "not." If people have enough money, it appears, they can buy out of consensus-building, buy out of community, buy out of compromise, buy out of, around or over the common will.

Consider what it is that people who have money — not super money, just regular money — do with it. The first thing they buy is a private museum, a car to replace a mass transit. The next thing they buy is independent square: a house to replace an apartment. And then they buy a larger house. And then a second house in the country.

One of the rules of the road to riches is that the more money you have, the more you own by yourself and the less you have to share. Indeed, the less you learn about sharing.

In upwardly mobile homes, the process of compromising, taking turns or making group decisions is increasingly circumvented by buying . . . out. The more upward, the more likely it is for children to have their own bedrooms, their own dogs, their own cars to shoot. Rather than hassling over the TV, the family gets a second. Rather than coming to terms with teen-agers over the telephone, the teen-agers get their own.

At the most rarefied level of timeliness, helicopters, corporate empires and vast personal estates, the whole process of buying out gets vastly exaggerated. The very rich negotiate late and decide more. They don't have to arrive at a consensus among their employees; they tell them what to do. The man who pays for the microphone gets to make the rules; the person who owns the plane decides where it should fly. If you have the money, you can do it. Whatever it is. For many, that is the point of getting rich.

I am not suggesting that people go directly from buying a second television set to buying private planes for the Contras. Nor that every wealthy person is incapable of community. It is far more subtle than that. But the very rich, whether they are on Wall Street or Washington, whether in public or privately, are so sure of their impotence with process, impatience with community constraints. With the Congress. With the law.

The Reagan administration, rife with the attitudes and problems of the rich, regarded the congressional "no" to supplying Contras as a traffic jam they could fly over. The adventure capitalists, for their part, sprung for the planes. They bought out of the system.

And for a while in America, the rich had not only their own private estates. They had their own private foreign policy.

Storms, floods pummel area along 1,000-mile 'battlefront'

Torrential rain, wind and lightning ripped along a 1,000-mile atmospheric battlefront Thursday from Texas to Wisconsin, forcing hundreds of evacuations, washing out a bridge, eroding a highway and knocking radio and TV stations off the air.

Two deaths in Oklahoma were blamed on storms, lightning struck at least 10 people in Wisconsin and at least six people were injured when heavy rain collapsed the roof of a business in Grand Prairie, Tex., outside Dallas.

The clash of warm air from the Gulf of Mexico with cool northern and western air brought reports of funnel clouds and flash flood watches across the nation's midsection. Tornado watches were in effect in 57 Texas counties, and a few funnels touched down but did no damage.

Flooding forced hundreds of people to flee from their homes in Oklahoma, where rivers were still rising Thursday night.

In Michigan, east of the aerial boundary, muggy heat threatened farm animals and caused a run on air conditioners as utilities generated record amounts of power.

The Oklahoma City area was hit hard, with 9 inches of rain falling Wednesday, sometimes at the rate of an inch an hour. Torrential rain hit for a 10th consecutive day Thursday, a 100-foot long bridge was washed out and reservoir flood gates were open to release rising water.

Flood damage in Oklahoma could run as high as \$20 million, said state Civil Defense Director Norris Price. "We're in a mighty tense situation," Price said.

Thursday was the 10th straight day of rain in Oklahoma, and the National Weather Service predicted that up to 7 more inches could fall by the weekend.

"It came up so fast my husband was putting furniture up on blocks, on top of tables, whatever he could find," said Lois Knapp in Lindsay, 45 miles south of Oklahoma City, where 500 families were forced to higher ground.

"I can tell right now it's not going to be high enough."

A 14-year-old boy died Wednesday

when he was washed into a creek and a 2-year-old girl died Thursday, when her family's car washed off a road. Her mother, a sister and a brother clung to a tree and were saved when a passerby heard their screams.

In Wisconsin, at least 10 people were struck by lightning Thursday, including six members of a Pennsylvania Air National Guard unit hit near an airplane during a refueling operation at Volk Field. Four of the guardsmen and two civilians, two women preparing for softball practice, a store clerk hit as she spoke on the phone near Wisconsin Dells and a man in a boat on Lake at LaCrosse, were hospitalized. None was critically injured, officials said.

In Monroe, Wis., high winds blew part of radio station WEEZ's roof into a parking lot Wednesday. The station's FM transmission was cut off, but its AM station continued broadcasting.

"We can't see sky through the roof or anything, but we can't reach the parking lot either," said WEEZ reporter Sue Schumacher. "And there's water leaking everywhere."

In Guthrie, Okla., several hundred residents headed for high ground

Thursday after Cottonwood Creek rose to 27.4 feet. Rural homes were evacuated near Norman, and an Army helicopter rescued a woman from a flooded road.

Marion Gandy, 66, said he has been chased out of his home by floods eight times since 1959. "If my insurance pays me enough, I'm going to go ahead and move out this time," he said.

Gov. Henry Bellmon, who surveyed some of the flood damage in Guthrie by helicopter and on foot Thursday, promised to move as quickly as possible to get help for the stricken town.

About 100 people were housed in a shelter in Guthrie, but officials said they did not know how many people may have taken up with friends or relatives.

Roads throughout central Oklahoma were flooded, and rush hour traffic was snarled when the interchange where the state's two major interstates meet in downtown Oklahoma City was closed by erosion.

"There was nothing underneath the pavement and they're working now trying to fill it back in," said Jim Sim, spokesman for Oklahoma's Department of Transportation. He said repairs were expected to have the junction of I-35 and I-40 ready for traffic Thursday afternoon.

A broken drainage dike sent water swirling into Hamburg, Iowa, although floodwaters were receding after causing at least \$7 million in cropland damage. No homes were flooded, but emergency shelters were being prepared.

"We've called in the National Guard from Red Oak and we've got calls in for those big pumps," said Mayor Bob Mason.

In Kansas, where a tornado ripped the roof off a factory.



Senate passes spending bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate refused Thursday to trim a nearly \$10 billion spending bill that violates the budget, but lawmakers resisted most attempts to add new spending.

On a 61-30 vote, the Senate killed an amendment by Sen. Steve Symms, R-Idaho, to strip everything except farm aid from the fiscal 1987 supplemental appropriations bill.

Then, by 52-39, it refused an attempt by Sens. Phil Gramm, R-Texas, and Carl Levin, D-Mich., to send the \$9.6 billion bill back to committee with instructions that its spending boosts be offset with cuts or tax increases.

"Farm families, grain elevator operators and other people are being held hostage to a system that just doesn't call for any fast action," said Symms, complaining about the less-than-urgent spending programs that were attached to the emergency cash fix for farmers.

The \$6.7 billion in subsidies for the Commodity Credit Corporation would not itself violate the budget, as Congress' accounting system already includes the spending. However, the legislation was required before the money could be released, and other spending was attached.

The bill also includes money to cover already-approved government pay and pension increases, military and foreign aid programs, and a variety of domestic projects ranging from an archaeological dig in Nevada to an \$8 million study of weeds.

All those and others, in a package that President Reagan's advisers say he would sign, add spending in violation of the budget rules. Even before the supplemental bill, spending in fiscal 1987, which ends Sept. 30, is exceeding the budget's \$1 trillion limit.

"We have people who say we're for fiscal responsibility, and yet they vote for programs without paying for them," said Gramm.

Nine girls and six boys had survived the cut going into the final afternoon competition.

Sirhan loses 9th parole bid

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Sirhan Sirhan lost his ninth bid for freedom Thursday after serving 18 years in prison for the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, a killing the head of the parole board called a "crime against the American people."

The three-member board made its unanimous decision after 90 minutes of deliberation. Sirhan will not be considered for parole again until March 1993.

The panel recommended that Sirhan undergo extensive psychiatric evaluation, that he pursue vocational training, participate in Alcoholics Anonymous sessions, remain free of disciplinary actions, consolidate his college credits into an associate of arts degree and provide documentation of any job offers.

Cuban officer flees to U.S.

WASHINGTON (AP) — A high-ranking Cuban military officer and his family defected to the United States on Thursday, flying a small plane to Key West Naval Air Station in Florida, U.S. officials said.

The officials identified the Cuban as Brig. Gen. Rafael del Pino Blaz, Patrick Korten, a Justice Department spokesman, said del Pino was the deputy chief of the Cuban Defense Ministry, the No. 2 position in the ministry. Del Pino formerly was chief of the Cuban Air Force, Korten said.

Korten said del Pino requested asylum when he landed with his wife and three children and was now undergoing questioning.

U.S. officials privately indicated their delight at the development. Officially, however, the administration said little about the defection.

Shooting suspect in custody

MIAMI (AP) — A man accused of shooting to death three workers during a \$1,700 robbery at a fast-food restaurant was arrested Thursday as he stepped off a bus in Louisville, police said.

Burnell Hingwood, 18, who worked at the Wendy's restaurant in Fort Lauderdale for 3½ months prior to Saturday's killings, surrendered peacefully to three officers in Hammond, La., said Lt. Steve Gamble of the Hammond police.

Fort Lauderdale police had issued a bulletin warning that Hingwood should be considered armed and dangerous, but Gamble refused to say if the man had a weapon when arrested.

Nixon memo possible Watergate key

WASHINGTON (AP) — Newly released White House papers of Richard M. Nixon showed Thursday that the seed of the Watergate scandal may have been a Jan. 14, 1971 memo from the president to his chief of staff, H.R. Haldeman.

It would seem that the time is approaching when (Democratic National Chairman) Larry O'Brien is held accountable for his retainer with (Howard) Hughes," Nixon dictated in a note from Air Force One. "Perhaps Colson should make a check on this."

O'Brien had been once on public relations retainer for Hughes, the reclusive billionaire. Many believe that Nixon's thirst for information about O'Brien was behind the burglary of Democratic Party headquarters in the Watergate Office Building on June 17, 1972.

O'Brien could not be reached by telephone for comment Thursday, and a recording device said his office was closed until next week.

Charles Colson, who pleaded guilty to obstruction of justice in a Watergate-related crime and served six months in prison, played a principal role in the Watergate affair. The memorandum was among 267,500 pages of Nixon documents released to public view Thursday by the National Archives, which has had custody of them since Nixon resigned on Aug. 9, 1974.

Two weeks after he fired his top aide, Haldeman and John Ehrlichman as the Watergate story unfolded in the spring of 1973, Nixon received a memo from speech writer Patrick Buchanan advising that the president cut his ties with associates who were involved in the scandal.

"If they are to survive, they have to do it on their own," Buchanan wrote. "The only question extant now, it seems, is whether we are going down as well."

Nixon appended his own critique of the Buchanan memo: "A very good analysis."

Other documents showed that Nixon once suggested that Internal Revenue Service audit the tax returns of every member of Congress — and that Cabinet members and top White House aides be audited as well to deflect criticism.

Nixon sent the suggestion to Haldeman with a cover note that "this, incidentally, is highly confidential. You should make no copies except the necessary working file."

Only reporters were at the National Archives' warehouse in nearby Alexandria, Va., when the Nixon collection was opened. The seizure of the papers by Congress and their release to public view has been a bitter legal fight that issues carried to the Supreme Court.

Reagan advisers back hospital tests for AIDS

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan's domestic policy advisers recommended Thursday that he urge states to start routinely testing all hospital patients for AIDS, administration sources said.

The Cabinet-level Domestic Policy Council also recommended that the federal government take steps to make AIDS blood tests routine in Veterans' Administration hospitals, federal prisons and federal clinics, said the sources, who insisted on anonymity.

The White House earlier said Reagan was leaning toward recommending routine AIDS tests for marriage license applicants, and his Public Health Service already has endorsed the idea of AIDS tests for immigrants.

The centerpiece of the new Reagan administration policy — if the president approves it, as expected — will be a call for state and local authorities to put into place routine AIDS tests for:

- Patients admitted to hospitals.
- Prisoners in state and local jails.
- Couples seeking to get married.
- Patients at clinics that treat sexually transmitted diseases.

Reagan was present at the discussion.


Dr. C. Everett Koop, the surgeon general, and Secretary of Education William J. Bennett have engaged in a public quarrel over AIDS testing in recent weeks, with Bennett the loudest proponent within the administration of widespread testing.

Koop and the Public Health Service have opposed mandatory tests on grounds it may discourage carriers of the deadly AIDS virus from coming forward.

Koop had voiced concerns at a Domestic Policy Council meeting Wednesday that the blood tests are not 100 percent accurate and that false positive results could cause serious harm to the persons involved.

Canadian questions hiring of Deaver

OTTAWA (AP) — The opposition Liberal Party will press Prime Minister Brian Mulroney's government for more answers on the hiring of former White House aide Michael Deaver as a policy adviser, a Liberal legislator said Thursday.

John Nunziata, who on Wednesday questioned the government on the Deaver affair, said the facts seem to

indicate that the Canadian government aided and abetted Deaver in breach of the law.

Nunziata said he was concerned that "either formal or informal discussions" about the one-year, \$105,000 contract took place while Deaver was still working for President Reagan. He noted that Deaver took the job as an aid and policy adviser shortly after resigning as White House deputy chief of staff in May 1985.

Wednesday to summon Canada's ambassador in Washington, Allan Gotlieb, to appear before parliament's foreign affairs committee to answer questions about the Deaver affair. Gotlieb hired Deaver to advise on Canada's attempts to get the United States to reduce smogstack and vehicle emissions causing acid rain.

Foreign Minister Joe Clark rejected Nunziata's suggestion, stating there had been no breach of Canadian law.

Canada filed a diplomatic protest Wednesday over U.S. independent counsel Whitney Seymour's attempt to subpoena Gotlieb to testify at Deaver's perjury trial.

Canadian officials said the special prosecutor's request violated Gotlieb's diplomatic immunity and, therefore, Canadian sovereignty.

Nunziata agreed that Gotlieb should not have to testify. But noting that Clark has indicated parliament would be justified in investigating the affair if U.S. authorities find Deaver guilty

of breaking the law, Nunziata said: "It seems that we're in a Catch 22 situation. If Gotlieb's evidence is crucial and it won't be available, then we'll never know whether an appropriate U.S. authority determines that Deaver broke U.S. laws."

Foreign aid cut in protest of Fiji coup

SUVA, FIJI (AP) — The United States and New Zealand have suspended aid to Fiji to protest the coup that ousted an elected government, and hundreds of ethnic Indians, citizens sought information Thursday about emigrating.

Fiji's 1.5 million people are divided by 11 ethnic groups. The Indian-dominated government of Prime Minister Timoci Bavadra on May 14, a month after it took office, said it would be wanted to reserve political power for native Fijians, who are slightly outnumbered by ethnic Indians.

A U.S. Embassy statement said: "United States law prohibits use of foreign aid funds to provide direct assistance to any country whose duly elected head of government is deposed by military coup or decree."

In New Zealand, Prime Minister David Lange announced the suspension of aid and ordered 47 Fijian soldiers training there to go home.

"Our aid program has been put on hold. It will be reassessed when the position in Fiji becomes clearer," he said.

Current aid figures were not available, but the United States provided \$320,000 in 1982. New Zealand has been one of Fiji's biggest donors, providing \$3.8 million in 1982, according to U.S. State Department figures.

Trudeau unloads attack on accord

TORONTO (AP) — Pierre Elliott Trudeau has returned to the political battlefield in pugnacious form by condemning a constitutional accord on Quebec as a dark day for Canada and calling Prime Minister Brian Mulroney a weakling.

Ending three years of silence since leaving office, the former prime minister exploded into the headlines by warning that Mulroney's plan to recognize French-majority Quebec province as a "distinct society" and make other constitutional changes will render the Canadian federation impotent.

While Trudeau's polemics caused a sensation, most federal and provincial leaders dismissed his attack.

NATO allies turn down U.S. request for help with patrols

WASHINGTON (AP) — State Department officials said Thursday the NATO allies had turned down a U.S. appeal for help in protecting oil tankers in the Persian Gulf.

But Secretary of State George P. Shultz is likely to try again when he meets next month with allied foreign ministers in Reykjavik, Iceland.

The appeal for help in patrolling the gulf was made by Defense Secretary Caspar W. Weinberger at

a two-day meeting of defense ministers in Brussels. A State Department official, who demanded anonymity, said Weinberger was turned down with the "traditional argument that the gulf is outside NATO's defense area."

Besides, the official said, "they turned us down because this was not the forum in which to make the proposition."

The right place, he said, is the

North Atlantic Council meeting Shultz will attend June 11-12 in Reykjavik.

But, the official said, "the reading we came away with from Brussels would discourage optimism. From the discussions, I'd say there is little likelihood they would accede to our appeals."

Meanwhile, Charles E. Redman, the department spokesman, described the U.S. consultations with the allies as inconclusive.

He said "courses of actions" were discussed with a number of North Atlantic Treaty Organization countries. The U.S. official also took note of reports that the Netherlands was willing to provide assistance.

However, Redman said, "I am not prepared to come to any conclusion. It's a consultative process."

The Reagan administration decided earlier to put U.S. flags and American captains on Kuwaiti oil

tankers to deter attacks by Iran. Also, on two occasions, the U.S. Navy escorted Kuwaiti merchant ships in delivering U.S. tanks to Bahrain, an oil-rich gulf country.

Several members of Congress voiced concern the United States could become involved in the war between Iran and Iraq.

Redman acknowledged the gulf is not within the North Atlantic Treaty Organization's "geographic area of responsibility."

Nevertheless, he said, "the alliance recognizes that events outside its treaty area can affect the security interests of its members. In

that respect, NATO is on record as urging support for those alliance nations which have the capability of protecting western interests."

Asked if Weinberger had been rebuffed in Brussels, he said: "I am not prepared to come to any conclusion. It's a consultative process."

At the same time, Redman defended the administration's dealings with Congress over the gulf but said it did not inform the legislators Navy ships escorted U.S. tanks to Bahrain.

Stark to sail for home after temporary repairs

MANAMA, Bahrain (AP) — Repair work to make the USS Stark seaworthy for the voyage home will begin next week, the U.S. military said Thursday. An Iraqi missile attack May 17 killed 37 of the frigate's sailors and wounded 21.

Lt. Col. C. Manier of the U.S. Central Command told The Associated Press the repair ship Acadia had been summoned to Bahrain from the western Pacific to help with the work and was expected to arrive Monday.

The guided-missile frigate Stark was towed to an anchorage three miles off this Persian Gulf island nation two days after the attack. Manier said it would be brought to a pier belonging to Bahrain's Arab Iron and Steel Co., where the Acadia will dock.

He said repairs "intended to make the Stark seaworthy" would take a month, and "she'll then be sailing to the United States, where major structural repair and equipment replacement will take place."

Current plans call for the Stark to arrive at Mayport, Fla., on Aug. 5, he said.

Asked about the crewmen who survived the attack on the Stark and remained aboard, he said they were "busy and coping well."

Repairing the Stark is "a very expensive job," because the equipment was "essentially destroyed," he said. No official estimates of the damage have been released.

The decision on repairs was made by Navy investigators, led by Rear Adm. Grant Sharp, who have been on the frigate for nine days.

One object of the probe is to determine whether the anti-missile system was faulty when the attack

occurred. Manier said no information would be disclosed until the investigation is completed.

An investigative group from the House Armed Services Committee staff, led by John Lally, finished its work and left Bahrain.

U.S. Embassy sources said Sens. John Glenn, Democrat from Ohio, and John Warner, Virginia Republican, arrived Thursday. Sen. James Sasser, a Tennessee Demo-

crat, was here last week.

Sen. Robert Byrd, the West Virginia Democrat who is Senate majority leader, appointed the three senators to investigate.

Glenn and Warner also will visit Iraq, Saudi Arabia and Kuwait.

The U.S. Central Command, based at MacDill Air Force Base in Florida, is responsible for operations in the Middle East by any of the U.S. armed forces.

Team adds day to stay in Iraq

BAGHDAD, Iraq — A U.S. team investigating the May 17 Iraqi air attack on the Navy frigate Stark extended its stay here by another day Thursday after apparently failing to get all the answers it wanted from the Iraqis.

The nine-man group, led by Rear Adm. David Rogers of the U.S. Joint Chiefs of Staff, was originally supposed to have returned to Washington Wednesday night after interviewing the Iraqi pilot who fired at least one missile on the Stark, killing 37 of its crew.

The United States has accepted Iraq's apology for the "unintentional" attack and its offers of financial compensation. But Washington and Baghdad were evidently not seeing eye-to-eye on a "joint investigation" offered by Iraq as a sign of good will.

Sources who did not want to be identified said that the Iraqis were insisting that there was no need for a face-to-face interview with the pilot.

The Iraqi military was depicted as feeling that this would be an affront to their dignity and that the Americans should direct their questions through senior Iraqi officers and accept the answers relayed back to them.

The four-day Baghdad investigation appeared to have disclosed few new facts that would alter the original assumption that the pilot thought he was firing on a U.S. Iranian warship trying to make its way to the upper Gulf.

Senior U.S. Navy officers have conceded that the pilot may not have heard the warnings. The Stark's captain, Cmdr. Glenn Brindel, has also disclosed that his ship had recently been deployed in the upper Gulf and practically had no previous experience with Iraqi aircraft.

Iran claims U.S. diverted its airliner

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — An American warship forced an Iranian jetliner to change course over the Persian Gulf earlier this week, a senior Iranian airline official said Thursday.

The official, reached in Tehran by telephone, said the pilot messaged Iran-Air's dispatching center in Tehran that "the Americans are threatening us."

He said the plane was en route from Shiraz in southern Iran to Doha, Qatar, Tuesday when a U.S. Navy vessel near Bahrain "ordered the pilot to change his flight path."

According to the official, who would not reveal his name, the American warning was given by radio at 7:40 p.m. He said the plane changed course, with the aid of Bahrain air controllers, and landed at Doha at 8 p.m.

BPA chief: Long-term power outlook good

BURLEY — Although the Bonneville Power Administration has some problems — like an anticipated \$161 million shortage — the administration is optimistic about its long-term outlook.

That was the message from BPA Administrator James J. Jura, who met with representatives from southern Idaho regional power companies Thursday in Burley.

Jura warned that some regional customers appear to be leaning toward independence from BPA, which could weaken the federal agency, while possible fights from the horizon from legislators in Washington and California.

"If we can keep together as a region, I think the long-term prospects are extremely

good," he said. The BPA is working to address a number of short-term problems, he said.

One problem is declining revenues, with BPA predicting a \$161 million shortage for the 1986-87 fiscal year ending this September. This deficit follows a \$66 million loss last fiscal year, he said.

"The financial situation in '87 happens to be very troublesome," he said.

Regional sales are on target, but the poor water year has had a drastic impact on outside revenues, he said. Due to the water situation, BPA pulled out of non-firm sales to California in January. The loss averaged

about \$1 million per day, "a very, very significant amount," he said. BPA has recently re-entered the California market, he added.

The BPA is currently in the final stages of seeking a 9 1/2 percent rate increase for the coming two years to help deal with the deficit, he said. It has also cut back on many programs, and is reorganizing its own administration to cut costs, he said.

There now is an "absolute hiring freeze" at BPA, he said. "We are going to eliminate a number of jobs," he said.

"The overall objective is to come up with an organization that's leaner, has fewer

people, and is more decentralized," he said. An early retirement option, called "the window of opportunity," is being offered to 325 employees in the Portland and Vancouver, Wash., areas to further reduce staff sizes, he said.

Jura called a plan for power administration repayment reform "a bullet we've been dodging every year." Some legislators in Washington D.C. see raising the low 4 percent interest BPA pays on a \$60 billion federal investment as an easy way of increasing federal revenues and reducing the national deficit, he said.

"It's a double-edged sword," he said. "We have what we don't really consider as low rates, but people outside the area consider them low rates." For example, BPA ratepayers pay about five times less than do ratepayers in San Diego, Calif., he said.

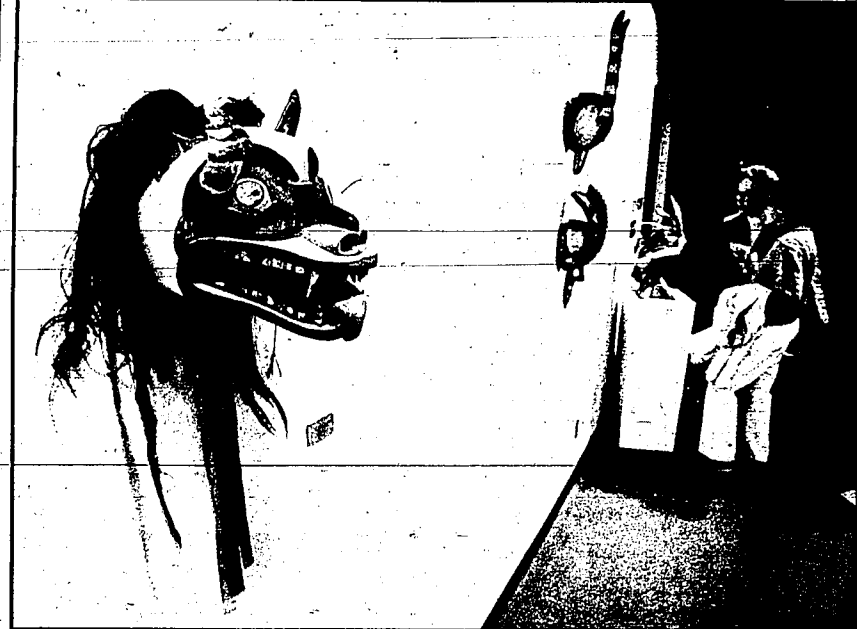
BPA loan appears to be an attractive way to reduce the deficit to some of these higher ratepayers, he said. A bill introduced last January by Florida Sen. Lawton Chiles would have introduced variable interest rates on the loan for BPA and other regional power administrations.

The amendment was fought by regional interests, and the initial threat is gone, he said. Since the BPA is a federal agency it cannot lobby Congress, and therefore regional customers must be responsible for any lobbying efforts, he said.

Because BPA is finding the loan program under attack annually, Jura said that it may be appropriate for the problem to be fixed once and for all. He predicted that changes may be made, perhaps a change in the law that would prevent the yearly struggle.

The BPA is considering adding a regional

PCB spills Trucking outfit must pay for cost of cleanup — EPA

IDAHIO FALLS (AP) — The Idaho Falls trucking company whose truck crashed May 16 near Fairfield while carrying PCB-contaminated transformers faces primary responsibility for cleanup, a federal official says.

Rocky Mountain Transport has contracted with Idaho Power Co., the source of the transformers, to conduct the cleanup. The work was scheduled to be finished Thursday, officials said.

Bill Fredet, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency inspector, said the trucking company is being cited and is responsible for the cost of the cleanup.

Brent Morgan, who runs Rocky Mountain Transport, could not be reached for comment. But an employee told The Post-Register that he had been advised by his attorney not to discuss the matter with the media because of possible litigation.

The truck's manifest, which tells

what it is carrying, was in error by not reporting the high levels of PCBs, said Jim Taney, an Idaho Power spokesman. An internal investigation is being conducted by Idaho Power.

PCBs, or polychlorinated biphenyls, are suspected carcinogens that were used in electric transformers until 1979. Under federal law, material with PCB levels below 50 parts per million are not required to be reported. Up to 500 ppm is considered — PCB-contaminated material and over 500 ppm is considered to be PCBs.

EPA investigators found levels of up to 610 ppm at the site of the crash, but said there was no community health threat from the spill.

The transformers were heading to Tiffany Metals, an Idaho Falls salvage company that recycles transformers. Idaho Power disposes of about 2,100 transformers a year.

PCB spill discovered at Bliss weigh station

BLISS (AP) — An Environmental Protection Agency cleanup team from Boise planned today to remove about 25 square feet of soil and asphalt contaminated with hazardous PCBs from a truck weigh station on Interstate 84.

Gary Burkett, a water quality specialist with the Idaho Division of Environment in Twin Falls, said about four gallons of oil containing polychlorinated biphenyls was found spilled Thursday morning at the weigh station, about four miles west of Bliss.

There was no indication of the source of the leak or when it occurred, but Burkett said environmental officials hatched the area and solidified the suspected cancer-causing liquid with soil.

PCBs were used for years as

coolants in electrical transformers, before being outlawed in 1979 when it was discovered they may cause cancer.

It was the second spill of the chemical this month in southern Idaho. On May 15, a truck carrying hundreds of transformers to a salvage yard in Idaho Falls crashed on U.S. Highway 20 near Fairfield. That spill still was being cleaned up on Thursday.

Burkett said the EPA cleanup team would take the contaminated material from the Bliss weigh station to an approved disposal site. Two people got some of the PCB oil on their shoes, which have been double-bagged and also will be disposed of according to state and federal regulations, he said.

Body of murder victim remains unidentified

TWIN FALLS — The identity of a male murder victim whose body was found Wednesday northwest of Buhl remained a mystery Thursday, but Twin Falls County Sheriff James Munn said a number of leads have been received and were being investigated.

"The response has been excellent," Munn said of the appeal

through the media for help in identifying the victim. "We have some getting a number of calls and will be checking out every possibility."

The body of a white male subject, 30 to 40 years of age, and believed to have been dead for at least two weeks, was found by Mr. and Mrs. Larry Olson as they were walking early Wednesday along a county road northwest of Buhl near Miracle Hot Springs and the Magic Water

project. An autopsy revealed the victim died of a severe beating about the head.

Munn said his office is hoping someone will recognize the description of the victim and come forward to help make an identification. Two tattoos on the victim's arms and a metal plate in the jaw along with dental features are being studied and officers hope these may lead to a positive identification.

In March of 1985, a skeleton was found in the same general vicinity and was determined to be that of a man of Indian or Mexican descent. Although a reconstruction of features was made and pictures widely circulated, the individual has never been identified.

The tattoo on the left arm of the latest victim is believed to include the name "Debby." It also includes

Commerce official lays instate groundwork

TWIN FALLS — Six weeks into his job with the Idaho Department of Commerce, Gary W. Whitwell has begun seeking foreign trade — by traveling in Idaho.

Whitwell, one of two newly appointed international trade specialists with the state agency, says he will prospect for export or import deals first at home.

"My goal is to go out and find the people that have an interest in exporting or importing," determine the amount of interest and assist them in getting the job done," he said in an interview Wednesday in Twin Falls.

Whitwell, 42, needs little introduction at some Magic Valley businesses. He was Twin Falls County Clerk from late 1976-78 and gained his basic training in overseas sales during four years in the early 1980s as export manager for Rangen's Inc.

Whitwell will concentrate in agricultural products and will work the southern and eastern parts of the state.

In its search for new trade, the Department of Commerce is targeting Canada, "a longtime trading partner, and the countries of the Pacific Rim," he said.

Nations such as Taiwan, Japan and South Korea repeatedly have returned to Idaho looking for trade opportunities. Three business mis-

sions from Taiwan alone have shopped in Idaho during the past six weeks, Whitwell said.

They may come looking for frozen potatoes or for machinery, but, "My mission should be trying to sell them everything in Idaho," he said.

Whitwell is trying to become familiar with available Idaho products and with companies angling for export or import business.

The mainstay of Idaho's production comes from small businesses, but many companies still do not consider exporting as part of their marketing mix.

Like Americans, consumers in other countries are looking for useful products. Some businesses have lapped by using export markets only as a catch basin for the overflow from their production lines.

"There has been a problem in the past with people trying to ship their leftover products," Whitwell said. "We have to really gear our products; we have to make our products for them."

Whitwell was credit manager at Rangen's from 1978-84 and set up the company's export business. In the past three years, he has worked as a consulting credit manager for several businesses in southwestern Idaho.

Whitwell made the comments after assisting TradeSearch Import, a small Twin Falls export-import brokerage, in a presentation to the Twin Falls Rotary Club.

ACS points to name confusion

TWIN FALLS — The American Cancer Society, the nation's oldest cancer research organization, doesn't want to be confused with other organizations bearing a similar name.

Jim Leavitt of the American Cancer Society, Idaho Division, Inc., says his organization has had numerous calls since an Associated Press article was printed saying 97 percent of the United Cancer Council Inc., funds are used for solicitation.

Leavitt said the American Cancer Society has received many calls and inquiries from well-intentioned citizens who have confused the United Cancer Council with the American Cancer Society.

"Unlike our look-alikes, the American Cancer

Society, Idaho Division, Inc., has been fund-raising extensively to 12 percent last year," Leavitt said.

Cancer control programs remain our first priority."

"Misunderstandings created from such articles are difficult to overcome," he added. "The impact of the look-alike fund-raising organizations that stipend off contributions intended for the American Cancer Society are of great concern to our many dedicated volunteers. We are asking the public to be aware of who the American Cancer Society is and not to confuse it with other organizations."

1st Interstate presents display

School levies pass

Patrons in the Salmon and Blackfoot school districts approved a levy measure Thursday as administrators struggle to meet ambitious state education goals with what most consider inadequate funding.

A \$200,000 levy in Salmon was approved by 54 percent of district voters, 468 to 338. In Blackfoot, a 776-to-326 vote gave the \$385,000 supplemental request a 70.35-percent margin of approval. A simple majority was needed for passage of each.

"We're pleasantly surprised that it was so high, simply because the levy is so much ballyhoo from the Boise area that the school districts have more money this year," Blackfoot Assistant Superintendent Terry Dench said. "But our district really needed to pass this levy."

Salmon Superintendent Jim Smith said the extra money would allow his district to erase a \$128,000 budget deficit, meet a legislative resolution

that starting pay for Idaho teachers be raised to a minimum of \$15,000 a year, and buy some new textbooks.

The measure had failed, Smith said one of the district's elementary schools would have been closed, class sizes would have been increased, funds for athletic programs cut 30 percent, some high school elective courses eliminated and grounds care and janitorial services reduced.

The supplementary levy will increase Salmon-area property taxes by about 97 cents for each \$1,000 of assessed valuation.

Meanwhile, Blackfoot's Dench said passage of his district's \$385,000 levy still would allow local property taxes to go down 20 to 25 cents for each \$1,000 of assessed valuation. The supplemental measure replaces a \$375,000 levy passed a year ago.

Dench said the money would be used for operating expenses, building maintenance and repairs, and academic and vocational programs aimed at getting district-wide accreditation. Some also will be used for special programs and an emergency fund.

Mechanical causes ruled out in crash

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — There appeared to be no mechanical problems with the light airplane that crashed near Cody, Wyo., on May 20, claiming the lives of three Idaho Falls men, investigators have concluded.

Indications are that pilot John Chaffin, 49, might have lost control of the Piper Cherokee II, which crashed during a visual approach to the Cody airport, said Greg Felth, air safety investigator for the National Transportation Safety Board.

The crash killed Chaffin; Steve Burgraff, 37; and Gary Cain, 41.

"It's hard to tell right now, but various elements indicate the pilot may have lost control," Felth said.

offices in California, where electricity sales account for much of the BPA's revenue, he said.

"PG&E (Pacific Gas and Electric) is our biggest revenue customer," he said. "But we've doubled their power bill for the same amount of energy." PG&E challenged the higher rates, but the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission upheld BPA's decision, he said.

California also lost a recent court decision that could have forced BPA to permit line access to other competitive utilities. The loss was a "contradiction of our frustration down there," he said.

Jura said he blitzed the state to understand the political situation. Some California power company

customers warned him that BPA's powerful political muscle is weakening, he said.

The House Interior Subcommittee held hearings Wednesday on the issue, and Jura feels that some Californians would like to see legislative remedies to the situation. However, he doesn't feel that Congressmen George Miller of California, chairman of the subcommittee, wants legislative solutions.

"There's a tremendous amount of misinformation about Bonneville (to California)," he said. If BPA does a California office, it could help with public relations and also work to the advantage of both Californians and the BPA, he said.

Jura cited some bright spots for the BPA, including the rising price

of aluminum from 32 cents a pound to around 72 cents now. He said this is important because aluminum customers began paying BPA the standard electrical rate at 60 cents a pound, and will pay over the standard rate when the amount goes over 72 cents a pound.

In addition, BPA is planning to implement new regional marketing programs at the request of state governments and regional power customers, he said. The proposals will include a number of industrial and commercial partnerships with BPA and perhaps a residential wood heat program, he said.

The BPA will release public details of the proposals soon, with BPA officials promising to release the information first, he said.

The inspiration to produce an album didn't come until her early 30s, she said. "I just developed my croaky little voice and learned to dance. I enjoy performing and I enjoy being a nut," she says.

Anderson has been training a group of girls called The Miracletes, who tap, clog and perform drills to music she has composed herself. She is bringing five of the

younger girls to Saturday's performance at the mall.

"My personality is country music," Anderson says, "but my specialty is marches." Her second album contains marching and performing songs composed especially for The Miracletes. She holds group practices in a large room in her home and very seldom has less than 12 girls in the group, she says.

She describes the girls as kids "who have ability but would never have had a chance to be in a show group because of family financial hardships." Since forming the group, they have performed in parades, community events, the Salt Palace and churches.

Finding opportunities to perform is difficult, she says, because the group is not well-known. "Every year I make a little more progress," she says.

Returning to Twin Falls for Western Days will be a special event for The Miracle Lady. "I love Twin Falls. I love the people of Idaho.

They're just good people. They like my corny sense of humor," she says.

Anderson's love for Idaho has even provided the inspiration for a few songs, she says. "The Idaho Waltz" and "Salt Lake City Blues" are songs about her earlier days in Twin Falls that reflect her feelings about Idaho, she says. "Idaho has a special spot in my heart. I've got quite a few songs in the wings about Idaho," she says.

Despite Anderson's roots in Twin Falls, her albums are not available in local music stores, she says. The Music Center carried some of her sheet music and a few copies of her first album, but while the sheet music sold out, the records remained on the shelves. Since then, her Twin Falls fans have had to order albums directly from her, she says.

Anderson also works as a computer data terminal operator for the state of Utah. Her husband, Lamar, is also from Twin Falls and they have two children, a son and a daughter.

 this and stayed on the charts for a staggering 113 weeks. Capitol Records estimates the album's worldwide sales at 15 million since 1967.
 One record retailer, Tower Records, still sells about 100 copies a month, a respectable total for a contemporary album, and extraordinary for a 20-year-old one.
 "Later rock albums such as the Bee Gees' "Saturday Night Fever" and Michael Jackson's "Thriller" exploded it in sales, and not a single cut from the LP ever became a Top 40 hit. But "Sgt. Pepper" endures as rock's true classic because of its musical ambiguity, and because what it says about the pain and loneliness of growing up still touches the heart.
 When it first arrived, most critics acclaimed it a masterpiece far beyond what rock had ever known — the first and finest "concept album."

It is a verdict that apparently endures.
 British pop writer Paul Gambaccini, in a new book "Critics' Choice: The Top 100 Rock & Roll Albums of All Time," polled 81 British, German and American disc jockeys and critics.
 Still the champ after 20 years: "Sgt. Pepper."
 Capitol Records is betting that the current generation of record buyers still feels that way. It is releasing "Sgt. Pepper" as a compact disc on June 1 to mark the album's 20th anniversary.
 The CD will contain a two-second snarl of laughter and gibberish heretofore contained only on European versions of the album, and a high frequency note at the end of the album audible only to dogs — the inspiration, according to Capitol, of animal lover Paul McCartney.
 After all these years, critics and rock fans continue to debate whether "Sgt. Pepper" remains the

"greatest" album ever, or even the best Beatle album.
 Some Beatle fans and critics make strong cases for "Rubber Soul" or "Abbey Road." Gambaccini picks "Revolver," the album immediately preceding "Sgt. Pepper." Others name and Bob Dylan's finest works, such as "Blonde on Blonde," in that same class.
 In a new book, "It Was Twenty Years Ago Today," by former Beatle publicist Derek Taylor, Ringo Starr is said to prefer "Abbey Road."
 "The Rolling Stone Record Guide," for one, takes a dim view of "Sgt. Pepper," calling it a "somewhat stiff collection of generally less than great Beatles tunes vaguely molded into a whole," and also concluded that "Abbey Road" was better.
 The Mothers of Invention, rock's most irreverent group, produced a devastatingly funny parody album in 1968 titled "We're Only in It for the Money," satirizing the pretensions

of "Sgt. Pepper" right down to its fancy album cover.
 Oh, that devilishly clever album cover. It was the first to contain printed lyrics, a declaration of sorts that here, at last, were rock lyrics worth reading. And it quickly became a parlor game to name all the pop figures that peeped in.
 Of course, since McCartney was the only Beatle pictured backwards on the album cover, that meant Paul was dead, right?
 "For the cover we came up with a list of our heroes, like Oscar Wilde, Marlon Brando, Dylan Thomas, Aldous Huxley, Lenny Bruce," McCartney says in Taylor's book. "Being for the Benefit of Mr. Kite!" It took a 40-piece orchestra to create the album's unforgettable finale, "A Day in the Life," a chilling, sad musical voyage inspired by some mundane newspaper items: "Read the news today, oh boy . . . It winds up with an orchestra crescendo that can only be described as a cacophonous scale, finally con-

cluding with a 40-second piano chord. "She's Leaving Home," a tearful ballad about a young girl breaking away from her parents, was an evocation in the '60s of the deep misunderstandings between parents and their children that remains no less poignant today. "We gave her most of our lives; sacrificed most of our lives; Fun is the one thing that money can't buy."

'Creepshow 2': Dull as leftovers

CREEPSHOW 2 (R). A cut-rate sequel from those two popular masters of horror, novelist Steven King and director George Romero, that plays like leftovers. Only the second of the film's three episodes, in which some college kids are impelled by a mysterious blob in a seemingly idyllic lake, is at all effective. George Kennedy, Dorothy Lamour and Lois Chiles are wasted in the other two.

EXTREME PREJUDICE (R). Walter Hill's red-hot, ultra-violent action-adventure is so macho it verges on parody — on purpose. The "High Noon" simplicity of square-jawed Texas Ranger Nick Nolte's determination to take in Powers Boothe, his boyhood pal turned flamboyant drug king, is thrown away by a top secret DEA mission led by a ruthless Michael Ironside. Once again, Hill is concerned with defining masculine courage amid moral chaos, but this entertaining film is not to be taken too seriously. With Maria Conchita Alonso.

PLATOON (R). This is movie making with a zealot's fervor. Director-writer Oliver Stone, decorated Vietnam infantryman himself, clearly wants us to understand what fighting in that war was like. He succeeds with an immediacy that is frightening. War movies of the past, even the greatest ones, seem like crane shots by comparison. "Platoon" is at ground zero. And, not incidentally, Stone may have put a stake through the heart of all the slick Rambo heroics ever to slide onto a screen.

PROJECT X (PG). Once again Matthew Broderick takes on the

distasteful, vulgar, establishment, but this handsome, carefully designed film is not as satisfying or as credible as "Barfman." As likable as Broderick is, he is very nearly upstaged by a bright, adorable chimpanzee who becomes part of a top-secret Air Force project. With Helen Hunt.

RAISING ARIZONA (PG-13). The astonishing thing about this film — concerning the madcap kidnapping of a quadriplegic by an ex-con and his ex-policewoman wife — is how it can move so fast, be so loud and contain so

Pistons face jinx in NBA series finale

Fighting the Garden dragon

PONTIAC, Mich. (AP) — Vinnie Johnson got hot and the Detroit Pistons got to keep playing.

Johnson scored half of Detroit's points in a decisive 20-8 fourth-quarter run as the Pistons beat the Boston Celtics 113-105 Thursday night to force a seventh game in the NBA Eastern Conference finals.

"We have the type of players who have good one-on-one moves and I'm a streaky shooter," Johnson said. "Once I get going, I'm tough to stop."

Game 7 of the series will be played Saturday afternoon in Boston Garden where the Pistons have lost 17 consecutive games.

The Pistons opened the final quarter with the decisive run to turn on 64-43 advantage into a 104-91 lead with 5:04 remaining.

"At the start of the fourth quarter, we knew Larry Bird had it going," said Detroit guard Isiah Thomas, who finished with 21 points. "But Boston takes a breather sometime in the game and when it came, we took advantage of it."

Johnson and Adrian Dantley led the Pistons with 24 points each. Bird had 35 points for Boston, while Kevin McHale had 23.

"I think it was our own fault," Bird said. "We quit setting picks for one another. We quit doing what kept us in the game."

"It's all concentration. We were playing so well, and all of a sudden we just stopped. We just stagnated."

McHale, playing with a fever and upset stomach, said Johnson was making most of his points despite the best efforts of Boston guard Dennis Johnson.

"It's a hell of an offensive player," McHale said. "We played him pretty good. I thought DJ was all over him on some of those shots and he made them anyway."

The Celtics, playing without center Robert Parish, who was suspended for slugging Detroit's Bill Laimbeer in Game 5, and without Coach K.C. Jones, who

was attending his mother's funeral in California, appeared to tire in the fourth period but Detroit mistakes kept the outcome in doubt.

"I was resting Dantley and Bill Laimbeer for the stretch run," Detroit Coach Chuck Daly said. "But, when you get a group playing well, you try to ride with them."

After a basket by Johnson gave Detroit a 108-96 lead, the Pistons' Rick Mahorn grabbed a rebound and threw it the length of the court out of bounds with 3:29 remaining. Moments later, McHale snatched a ball from Dennis Rodman's hands and turned it into a three-point play. On the Pistons' next trip up the floor, Johnson was called for a double dribble.

Detroit called a timeout with 2:06 remaining. Laimbeer hit a jumper 10 seconds later to give the Pistons a 112-101 lead and Detroit appeared to settle down.

"We had a game plan and did just what we wanted to do for three quarters," said Boston assistant Jim Rodgers who ran the team in Johnson's absence. "We made our big mistake coming out in the fourth quarter when we got away from the game plan a little."

In contrast to Games 3 and 5, which were marred by fights, Game 6 was tough but clean except for a couple of minor pushing incidents involving Dantley and Alinge. After both incidents, the players shook hands and play resumed without incident.

Blackmon, who allegedly dropped his pants and made an obscene gesture to fans in the regional final Monday at Mississippi State City, Miss., was also publicly reprimanded

by the NCAA Division I baseball subcommittee "as a result of his inappropriate conduct at the conclusion of the championship game of the midwest regional," the statement said.

Oklahoma State Coach Gary Ward was also publicly reprimanded for "inappropriate comments made during the postgame press conference," Wright said.

"The committee will review Mississippi State's conduct as a host institution and further review the responsibilities of all regional sites during the summer meeting in Ju-

ly," the statement said. Miles said the baseball subcommittee met Thursday afternoon with Blackmon and Ward. He said the committee decided on a penalty and informed the school of their decision.

The school had a chance to appeal the decision and the matter would have gone to the NCAA Baseball Games Committee for a hearing, via telephone, Friday. That won't be necessary now, Wright said.

Oklahoma State is scheduled to play Arizona State at 4:10 p.m. Friday in a first-round College World

Series game at Rosenblatt Stadium. In the game in question, Oklahoma State beat Texas A&M 11-9 to advance to the CWS.

Several Oklahoma State players said they were harassed constantly by fans who were in outfield seats. They said that Blackmon was the most frequent target.

"There are an awful lot of people who go unsupervised in that ballpark who need a mental enema," Ward said at a post-game press conference. "It's a crying shame. If you have to rely on that kind of intimid-

ation to win, it's a total embarrassment to your program."

Ward admitted that Blackmon's action was "low class and I told him that. It's a disappointment because there's no way you can answer the bigot. All you can do is go down to his level and that's what he chose to do, and I told him I was extremely disappointed. But you go out center field for six games and take the stuff he was taking and see how you'd respond. Me, I'd just basically want to kill the SOB's."

Barring Blackmon and Ward from

the series would be an extreme penalty, Miles said earlier Thursday. Miles said the National Collegiate Baseball Championships handbook states the governing committee "may (1) reprimand publicly or privately; and/or (2) disqualify from future participation in championships; and/or (3) ban from participation in subsequent championship competition a student athlete or a representative of an institution who is guilty of misconduct occurring at or at any time preceding or subsequent to the competition during the official dates of the championship."

Flyers extend Stanley Cup to seven-game limit

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Combacks are getting to be the order of the day for the Philadelphia Flyers — and so are great performances from goaltender Ron Hextall.

"He's probably the best goaltender I've ever played against," Edmonton center Wayne Gretzky said after Hextall led the Flyers to their third comeback win in the Stanley Cup finals, a 3-2 victory Thursday night that sent the NHL championship series to a seventh game for the first time in 16 years.

"Just when you think you are going to bombard him, he comes up with big saves," said Gretzky, the NHL's leading scorer during the regular season. Daigneault, a defenseman who has seen limited playoff action, gave the Flyers the victory when he intercepted a bad clearing pass from Jari Kurri at the left point and drove a 55-foot slapshot through a maze of bodies and past Edmonton goaltender Grant Fuhr.

The goal, which capped another Flyers comeback from a 2-0 deficit, sent the Stanley Cup finals to a seventh and deciding game at the Northlands Coliseum Sunday night. It's the first time the finals have gone to seven games since 1971, when Montreal beat Chicago.

The Flyers are trying to become only the second team in NHL history to come back from a 3-1 deficit in the finals. Toronto lost the first three games in the 1942 finals before rallying to beat the Detroit Red Wings.

The Oilers beat Hextall twice in the first 15:15, as Kevin Lowe scored a shorthanded goal and Kevin McClelland banged in a rebound. But for the last 44:44, Hextall stonewalled the NHL's most potent offensive team. He

made 30 saves, capping his performance by robbing Mark Messier in the game's final seconds.

"If you had told me before the series that we'd come back from at least two goals down in three games, I wouldn't have believed it," Hextall said. "We just keep banging away, we never say die."

The Flyers, who have not scored the first goal in any of the six games, trailed 3-0 in Game 3 and 2-0 in Game 5 before coming back to win. They have given up the first two goals in each of the last four games.

"We got behind the eight-ball, but we were able to come back again," Hextall said.

The goaltender said the Flyers were anything but despondent between periods, even though they trailed by two goals after the first 20 minutes.

"We just went at them one period at a time," Hextall said. "We wanted to win the second period, and then we were just looking to win the third and maybe force overtime."

But, as it turned out, the Flyers didn't need overtime. Brian Propp scored a power-play goal at 13:04 of the third period to tie the score and Daigneault sent the outpouring crowd of 17,222 into ecstasy 1:24 later with his game-winner.

"I don't know if they were trying to defend the lead or not, but we certainly had more opportunities in the third period than we had in the first two," said Flyers Coach Mike Keenan.

Gretzky thought the Oilers had played better than the Flyers for the most part. "It was one of those nights where we felt we should have won the hockey game, but they got a couple of breaks at the end," said Gretzky.

Byrum sets torrid pace in Memorial

DUBLIN, Ohio (AP) — Curt Byrum matched the course record with an 8-under-par 64 and established a two-stroke lead Thursday in the first round of the Memorial tournament.

"I don't think I've ever had a better ball-striking round. That's as solid as I can play," said Byrum, who did not make a bogey and missed only one green on Jack Nicklaus' Muirfield Village Golf Club course.

Byrum, 28, not yet a winner in five seasons on the PGA Tour, birdied the final hole to tie the course record set by Mark McCumber in 1984 and take the two-stroke lead over Joey Sindelar.

"I really wasn't aware of the record," Byrum said. "I was just trying to enjoy myself. I started hitting them close and making the short putts."

The weather was hot and humid, with light, almost insignificant winds. And the touring pros took advantage of the near-ideal conditions to continue the exceptionally low scoring that has seen two tournament records tied and one broken in the last three weeks.

Another fell in this round. There were 49 subpar rounds, the most in any round in Memorial history.

"The fairways were perfect and the greens soft. You could go right for the pins," said Byrum, whose career best finish was a runner-up in the Quad Cities Open last year.

Following Sindelar at 67, were Tom Watson, a five-time British Open champion trying to fight his way out of a three-year non-winning string, and Scott Hoch.

"A little more fun," said Watson, who had an eagle 3 and missed only one green and two fairways. "The heart of my round was a birdie (a 6-foot putt) on 14 and the eagle on 15, where he hit a 2-iron second shot to within 15 feet of the cup."

Young hit a solo homer in the 10th that created a 6-6 tie after the Angels had taken the lead in the top half of the inning on Gary Petti's RBI single.

In the Angels' 12th, Darrell Miller singled and took third on Dick Schofield's one-out single. Petti then grounded out to first, and Miller raced to home while Schofield was trapped in a run-down.

But in the Orioles' 12th, Lee Lacy drew a leadoff walk from DeWayne Bulce, 23. Young fouled off two sacrifice attempts, then fouled off another pitch before homered to right.

TORONTO (AP) — Slugger Jose Canseco squandered home the tiebreaking run in the seventh inning and Dave Stewart pitched three hit balls before getting relief help in the ninth Thursday night, leading the Oakland Athletics over the Toronto Blue Jays 4-3.

Stewart, 6-4, struck out a career-high 10 and walked one in winning for the sixth time in his last eight decisions. He retired 17 straight batters before Tony Fernandez led off the ninth with a double.

Jay Howell replaced Stewart and allowed two-run homer capped a controversial six-run George Bell's RBI double with two outs. After

Evert struggles to French tennis win

PARIS (AP) — Defending champion Chris Evert, struggling with her timing and a little-known opponent, battled into the third round of the French Open as she other top seeds managed to stem the tide of upsets Thursday.

On the men's side, second-seeded Boris Becker, fourth-seeded Mats Wilander, fifth-seeded Miloslav Meir, sixth-seeded Yannick Noah and eighth-seeded Jimmy Connors all won, but none easily.

Evert, the No. 3 seed, beat France's Isabelle Demongeot 6-3, 7-5 to end a string of shockers by French players but she overhauled a stream of groundstrokes and was well beyond her best.

"I had the impression that she had some physical problems. She's get-

ting older now," Demongeot said after her defeat by the 32-year-old seven-time champion.

Evert said there was nothing wrong with her. "I felt great after my form so far,"

Evert's two main rivals for the crown, Martina Navratilova and Steffi Graf, also won.

Graf, the hottest player on the circuit, reached the fourth round and extended her six-month unbeaten streak to 35 matches by crushing 19-year-old Novotna of Czechoslovakia 6-1, 6-0.

The 17-year-old West German, seeded No. 2 and seeking her first Grand Slam victory, has dropped on-

ly five games in three matches and played a total of just over two hours.

Navratilova, without a tournament title this year, advanced to round three but went to pieces in the middle of her match against Adriana Villagran of Argentina.

Still the world's No. 1 player despite her poor season, Navratilova had a whirlwind start but then went into what she described as a "mental blackout" before advancing 6-0, 2-6, 6-2.

"There was no reason to put myself in that situation," she said. "I had no doubt I'd win the match. Only one seed went out on the fourth day of the tournament. No. 15 Brad Gilbert became the seventh men's seed to fall when he was top-

pled 7-5, 6-2, 6-1 by Spain's Jorge Arrese.

Gilbert just kept on making errors. "I bet I haven't made more mistakes in a whole tournament," the American screamed to himself as the match slipped away.

Thursday was a public battle on France and a big crowd saw all the other men's seeds in action reach the third round.

Becker of West Germany, two-time champion on the grass of Wimbledon, was unable to adapt his all-action game to clay, dropped a set before beating little-known American Mark Buckley 6-1, 4-6, 6-2.

Connors ground out a 6-4, 3-6, 7-6, 6-2 victory over Michael Westphal on his fourth match point.

The tiebreaker decided the match. It was down a break and came back to win the tiebreaker. I was a little tired," Connors said.

Wilander, the hottest clay courtier on the men's circuit going into the tournament, also squinted against another American, Paul Annacone, before winning 6-3, 6-4, 4-6, 6-4.

"It was important for me to play someone who comes to the net so much," Wilander said. "It helped me get my passing shots in shape. He was too good for me in the third set but he took a lot of risks."

Meir won more comfortably against Austria's most improved player, Stefan Edberg, 6-4, 6-1.

Noah, still idolized by the Parisian crowds although his home is now New York, made a remarkable recovery to gain the third round with 7-5, 7-5, a 7-5 victory over Christian Bergstrom of Sweden.

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Steve Garvey, the 10-time All-Star first baseman, does not want it to end this way. He would like to go out swinging.

Boosters may get legal reins

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP) — A booster could face up to five years in prison for paying a student athlete to attend a university under a bill approved Thursday by a state House committee.

Rep. Raymond Jettison, D-Baton Rouge, said the criminal penalty is needed in light of recent football recruiting scandals at Southern Methodist and allegations that led to the suspension of Tulane's basketball program.

Such scandals are ruining "the reputation of young kids and the universities," Jettison told the House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice, which approved the bill without objection.

Jettison cited the case of John "Hot Rod" Williams, who said he was given a \$10,000 bonus to attend Tulane. Williams later was acquitted of a sports bribery charge stemming from a point-shaving scandal at Tulane, which dropped his men's basketball program.

There are prison sentences for both the briber and the person accepting a bribe in gambling cases. In recruiting cases, only the athlete and the school are penalized. The NCAA has no jurisdiction over alumni or other outsiders paying an athlete to attend play at a school, but can declare an athlete ineligible or suspend a school's program.

Such recruiting practices are "turning universities into quasi-professional sports academies," Jettison said.

Jettison's bill also calls for a fine of up to \$10,000 for those who pay athletes to attend a college.

Bias drug testimony continues

UPPER MARLBORO, Md. (AP) — A teammate who was with All-American Len Bias on the morning he died, testified Thursday that the Maryland basketball player provided him with cocaine on three occasions. Another witness, a policeman moonlighting as a security guard, said he saw a possible drug transaction at a local nightclub involving Bias.

But former Maryland Coach Lefty Driesell said he didn't know Bias used cocaine until other team members told him so the morning his star player died.

The testimony came on the fourth day of the trial of Brian Tribble, who is accused of supplying Bias with the drug that killed him.

Bias teammate David Gregg provided information closely paralleling that Wednesday of Terry Long, another teammate, who said Bias died after an early-morning party last June 19 in which the players and Tribble snorted cocaine for several hours.

Prince George's County officer Ray Evans disclosed in testimony that he had written a report last June while acting as a security guard at a local club that said Bias may have been involved in a drug transaction.

The nightclub in question also was named in earlier testimony as the location of drug dealing by Tribble. During his testimony, Gregg said that he walked into Long's dormitory room around 3:30 a.m. on June 19, and saw Bias and Tribble standing around a large quantity of the drug on a mirror.

Asked by Bonalsi if he knew where the drug came from, Gregg said, "He (Tribble) said it came from the bottom of the stash. He said a kilo's coming tomorrow."

He said the players then snorted the drug and drank beers.

Recalling the final moments of Bias' life, Gregg said, "He began to shake about a minute and then he stopped. Then it happened again and Brian recognized it as a seizure."

Bias, the top pick of the Boston Celtics in the 1987 NBA draft, died of cocaine intoxication, according to the autopsy report.

Gregg told the court that after Bias collapsed, Gregg took the drug into his room, put it in a bag, and gave it to Tribble.

Gregg, like Long, testified that he had used cocaine with Bias long before that time. Gregg said he had snorted the drug "eight to 10 times," including "four to five times" with Bias.

When asked how many times Bias supplied the drug, Gregg answered, "Three times."

Gregg, who was suspended from the team in the wake of the incident, said he never paid for the cocaine.

The same players in the dormitory room that morning had also participated in a similar cocaine-snorting/drug party following Maryland's home game against North Carolina State on Jan. 23, 1986, Gregg said.

Driesell testified that Long and Gregg met with him in the basement of his home before noon on June 19.

repair a torn bleep tendon will keep Garvey out for three to six months, ending his 1987 season.

At 33 that might also mean it's time to retire.

But Garvey is determined to play an 18th season in 1988.

"I've enjoyed the 17 years and one more would be just right," he said.

His chances of doing it in San Diego, where his five-year, \$6.6 million contract expires after this season, are virtually non-existent. Publicly, General Manager Jack McKeon is non-committal.

"Just like we did with Graig Nettles, sooner or later you've got to make that determination," McKeon said.

"With a guy like Steve Garvey, you can never say it's the end until Steve Garvey says it's the end."

Garvey said he can accept severance from San Diego, his second baseball home.

"If that's it, I'm very pleased with what I've accomplished here. I feel I've helped raise the standards, the credibility, the interest, the awareness of what can be accomplished here," he said. "There's no reason this couldn't be the second best organization in baseball, right behind the Dodgers."

The apparent slight to the Padres is more of a compliment to the Los Angeles club, where Garvey played from 1970 through 1982. Garvey said he wants to play his last season in

southern California, and if San Diego is out of the picture, that would leave only the Angels and the Dodgers.

A Padres move to youth put Garvey on the bench on May 3, and with the team on a record pace for futility, he had little to look forward to the rest of this season even before his injury.

Garvey also was stung by the rejection and public rebuke by the Padres' owners of his overtures to head a group trying to purchase the team. Pending league approval, the Padres will be sold to Mariners' owner George Argyros, who must divest himself of the Seattle club.

Neither McKeon nor San Diego Manager Larry Bowa doubts

Garvey's ability to return in 1988. But they question whether there is a place for a 33-year-old first baseman who wants to play every day.

"All I can tell you is it would be very hard to sit out a whole year at 33," said Bowa, who ended his playing career two years ago at age 39.

"But Steve's not just your normal 33-year-old. He takes care of himself pretty good. He doesn't smoke, doesn't drink. He's in good physical condition. If he wants to come back, I wouldn't put it past him. But the road I think is very difficult," Bowa said.

When he came to the Padres amid great fanfare as a free agent in December 1982, Garvey was still in his prime. A dislocated thumb on Ju-

ly 29, 1983 ended his seven-year ironman streak at an NL record 1,207 games. He returned in 1984 to help lead the Padres to their first pennant, hitting a memorable home run in the bottom of the ninth inning of Game 4 of the NL playoffs to force a fifth game.

In 1985 and 1986, Garvey returned to the power-hitting form that led him to career totals of 272 home runs and 1,308 RBI.

He entered 1987 as the best fielding first baseman in history with a .996 fielding percentage. "I've been blessed," Garvey said. "My consecutive game streak, my MVP year, I'm 10-0 in All-Star games, 5-0 in playoffs. It's a career that's been charmed."

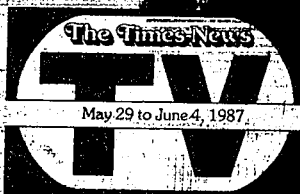

'Days and Nights of Molly Dodd' tries to be an unusual comedy

By PAUL ELIE

Is "The Days and Nights of Molly Dodd" too ambitious for prime-time TV?

Jay Tarses, the creator, producer and director of the new "dramatic comedy," which debuted three weeks ago, doesn't think so. But he realizes that the series, which airs Thursdays on NBC, may surprise viewers who've grown comfortable with "Family Ties" and "The Cosby Show."

"It's not your ordinary show," he says. "It's more liberate than most series, I think. And it's unpredictable. With most series, you know how it's going to end up. But 'Molly Dodd' is all over the place."

He may wonder about the show's ambitions, but Tarses is undoubtedly proud of "Molly Dodd." "There are echoes of other series, but really, it's a totally unique concept," he claims. "It's not mainstream, like 'Max Headroom,' but it's unlike anything you've seen. It's a dramatic comedy — but often it's not that funny."

"I see it as the story of a damaged romance," he explains. "Molly Dodd's approaching the age of 35. She has an ex-husband (William Converse-Roberts), and he just won't go away. She can't build on, and she can't let go."

"Ultimately it's very optimistic. But it describes a reality that's not a sitcom reality. There's a generation of rootless people. They've got no particular career goals, their romances are in a state of flux, they're living day to day, and they don't know what they're looking for."

Tarses has had experience tugging with an offbeat series. He produced "Buffalo Bill," the NBC series that starred Danny Coleman as aortic talk-show host Bill Bitterling. It drew critical praise but not enough viewers. "Molly Dodd," however, has started in a much stronger position than "Buffalo Bill." A month before its premiere, Rolling Stone touted it as the "most new TV show," and star Blair Brown ("Altered States," "Confidential Divide") was being praised for her sensitive portrayal of Molly.

More important, "Molly Dodd" has the blessing of NBC — and net-

work entertainment chief Brandon Tartikoff, who has previously supported such low-rated but critically lauded shows as "St. Elsewhere" and "Hill Street Blues." NBC has guaranteed that it will air "Molly Dodd" for at least 13 weeks and has scheduled the series as part of its blockbuster Thursday-night lineup — a position that should boost any new show's ratings.

"We were ready to go in September, but the show wouldn't have been showcased properly," Tarses says. "Now coming after 'Cheers' and (before 'L.A. Law,' we've got a good shot at finding an audience."

Tarses, who got his start as a writer for "The Bob Newhart Show," sees a link between "Molly Dodd" and such classic '70s series as "The Bob Newhart Show" and "The Mary Tyler Moore Show."

"If there's a connection it's in the writing. Those shows were characterized by good writing, and I think the writing of 'Molly Dodd' is pretty stunning."

"I think once people see the show, there's no way they won't connect with it," Tarses says. "It's very seductive. If people pay attention they'll be hooked. What I'm afraid of is that they might not pay attention."

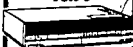

Shirley Jones faces husband's Alzheimer's disease on PBS

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Shirley Jones says it took a long time to put together the PBS play "There Were Times, Dear," but it was well worth the wait.

She stars with Len Cariou in the one-hour drama about the effects of Alzheimer's disease on one family.

It began more than three years ago when Jones was contacted by an old friend, actress-director Nancy Malone. She had directed her in the TV movie "Winner Take All," in which Jones played a compulsive gambler.

"She said, 'This is not for money, Shirley. I want to do a film about Alzheimer's disease to make people aware,'" she related. "Nobody in my family has ever had it, but it just scares me.

"Nancy asked if I would consider doing it if she could get the project together. I said sure. A year passed and I thought it had gone by the wayside. Then she called me and said she had the script. She wanted to do it the following month, but I had concerts planned and another film lined up."

It took two more years to get the play onto television. It will be telecast Wednesday at 10 p.m. on PBS. It was written by Harry Cauley; the executive producer was Linda Hope, the daughter of Bob Hope.

"There Were Times, Dear" was filmed entirely on location around Los Angeles.

"We worked hard," recalled the Academy Award-winning actress. "I can't remember working those hours, even when I did a TV series. We literally worked 18-20 hours a day. We were dropping in our tracks. We finished it in 10 days."

She stars as Suzanne, the wife of the victim, Bob. "It's mainly from her point of view," she said. "Other

films about Alzheimer's disease, like "Do You Remember Love," have been from the point of view of the victim.

"You see the slow disintegration of the family, the wife especially. They were lovers. They were never separated. It's a very moving piece. It takes place over five years. He takes his granddaughter out for ice cream and forgets how to get back. You see the frustration and anger begin to set in. He had been a patient, loving, giving man. You see his frustration and anger because he doesn't understand."

The play's title comes from the lyrics to the song "You Made Me Love You," which Bob sings. "When he forgets the lyrics his friends think he's kidding," said Jones. "He goes berserk and you see a side of the man you've never seen before."

Prior to this she co-starred with James Garner in "Tank," the last film she's made. She was in a two-part "Hotel" episode on TV, but has devoted most of her time to concerts.

"I've been making appearances with symphony orchestras, such as in Pittsburgh and Chicago," she said in an interview in the backyard of the spacious Beverly Hills home she shares with her husband, actor-businessman Marty Ingels.

"I do about two a month. The orchestra plays the first half. Then I do songs from Oklahoma, 'Carousel' 'The Music Man' and other shows. I talk about my movies, the people I've worked with. It's very satisfying and successful.

"There's no place for me to sing. There are no more television variety shows. I'm not a rock 'n' roll singer. I sang on 'The Partridge Family,' but I was backup for David Cassidy."

Her first series was "The Partridge Family," which also starred Cassidy, her oldest son by the late actor Jack Cassidy. The show, which ran for four years in the early 1970s, combined a situation comedy with singing. Her second series, "Shirley," ran briefly in 1979-80.

"There's a possibility of another series," said Jones. "We're discussing a one-hour drama, possibly with Aaron Spelling. The script is being written now. I love the idea. I hadn't wanted to do a series. I loved 'The Partridge Family.' It was great for me at the time. I'd been all over the world doing films and I wanted to stay home. TV was different then. Some things I've been offered lately I wouldn't do."

There's also talk of a reunion of "The Partridge Family," with Keith, the character played by Cassidy, as a grown-up singer.

David Cassidy is now in London doing a musical. Patrick Cassidy, another son, is in Paris doing the "Napoleon and Josephine" miniseries for ABC.

'Miami Vice' star is excited about new PBS movie role

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Edward James Olmos, who won an Emmy for his portrayal of the brooding police lieutenant on "Miami Vice," says his upcoming movie role as an inner-city Los Angeles school teacher is the best he's ever had.

Olmos will portray real-life Garfield High School teacher Jaime Escalante in "Walking on Water," a \$1 million film financed by PBS' "American Playhouse." Atlantic Richfield Co. and the Corporation for

Public Broadcasting.

The role of a calculus teacher who pushes his inner-city students to achieve is "by far the best role I've ever had," said Olmos, who won an Emmy for his portrayal of Lt. Martin Castillo on "Miami Vice."

"I'm glad that I got it at this time in my life. This character is as unique as Alan Bates' in 'King of Hearts'... I've never seen this kind of human before. He disarms you with his humor, then teaches you. He's so

calculating, the most calculating human I've ever met.

"... What motivates Escalante is the sheer love of the craft of teaching," Olmos said. "When he sees the light in a student's eyes, it's a natural high, like adrenaline. He needs it, like a performer who needs applause."

The film will be released to theaters in October or November and broadcast eventually over PBS.

Rue McClanahan says Blanche could be all talk and no action

LOS ANGELES — Rue McClanahan thinks her character of Blanche Devereaux on "The Golden Girls" is all talk and little action when it comes to men.

You get the idea watching the hit NBC comedy series that Blanche's conquests would fill the Manhattan telephone directory. But that genteel Southern lady may be just putting us on, as does the whole show, one of the funniest on the tube.

"Even Sophia dates more than Blanche," McClanahan says. "Blanche talks about men all the time, but she never dates."

"The Golden Girls," which completed its second season in fifth place in the Nielsen ratings, stars McClanahan, Bea Arthur (Dorothy), Betty White (Rose) and Estelle Getty (Sophia) as four women in their sunset years who share the same house in Miami.

The show backed television's youth trend and proved that there is life, as well as sex, after 50. Even Getty, who plays Dorothy's 80-year-old mother, gets around.

McClanahan sees Blanche as a character who was inspired by both Scarlett O'Hara of "Gone With the Wind" and Blanche DuBois of "A Streetcar Named Desire."

"She's in love with life and she loves men," she says. "I think she has an attitude toward women that's competitive. She is friends with Dorothy and Rose, but if she has enough provocation she becomes competitive with them. I think basically she's insecure. It's the other side of the Don Juan syndrome."

McClanahan, who spent most of her career on the stage, was in three other series. She co-starred with Arthur in "Mame," was in the short-lived "Apple Pie" and was Aunt Fran in "Mama's Family."

"When they sent me the script for 'The Golden Girls' they had me in mind for Rose," she says. "But I took to Blanche. They were thinking of Betty White for Blanche. Jay Sandrich was directing the pilot and he asked me if I'd mind reading for Blanche. I loved that."

"Bea called and said if I played Rose and Betty played Blanche it would be like doing 'Mame' again with Sue Ann Nivens. I said it looked

like we were going to switch roles. It would have worked the other way but it wouldn't have been as interesting."

The series, which was created by Susan Harris ("Soap"), was cast against type. White, who had been the man-hungry "Happy Homemaker" Sue Ann in "The Mary Tyler Moore Show" became Rose, the dumb one with the Little Orphan Annie eyes. And McClanahan became Blanche, unlike any other role she had ever played.

"Probably the closest I've ever done was Blanche DuBois in 'A Streetcar Named Desire' at the

Pasadena Playhouse," she says. "I think, too, that's where the name came from, although my character is not a drinker and not crazy."

Secretly, the role she really coveted was that of Sophia. "It's the best-written role and the funniest," she says. "I would love to have an opportunity to play that kind of role. But I wouldn't have a snowball's chance. When I heard Estelle had the role I was excited because I'd seen her in 'Torch Song Trilogy.'"

She is currently starring as Bananas in a production of "House of Blue Leaves" at the Pasadena Playhouse.

Series on Vietnam War is among new shows coming next season

WASHINGTON — CBS presented its eight hours of new fall programming for advertisers in New York on May 27. The biggest gamble in that schedule is the placement of "Tour of Duty," a one-hour dramatic series about a platoon in Vietnam, up against NBC's "The Cosby Show" and its spinoff "A Different World" on Thursday nights.

The pilot for "Tour of Duty," which is designed to lure young males from the "Cosby" audience, cost CBS some \$2 million.

"It was made clear to affiliates out in L.A. last week that the series won't cost that much every week, however. We expect that the costly combat scenes will be every three or four weeks once the series gets going," one CBS source told us. "Basically, the series will zero in on the relationships among the soldiers and their problems. It isn't meant to be a copy of 'Platoon'... (the grim, award-winning movie)."

Affiliates reportedly had their doubts about the counter-programming strategy, however.

June Allyson has joined Mel Torme, Betty Buckley and Kaye Ballard on the list of artists who will salute Cole Porter on the next "In Performance at the White House: A Tribute to American Music," to be taped June 28 and aired July 29 on PBS.

CBS' late night lineup for the fall will include "Hunter," the popular NBC crime drama starring Fred Dryer and Stephanie Kramer.

The network will also introduce "Diamonds," billed as an "original light-hearted drama series" about former-TV series private eyes who, though now divorced, learn to become private eyes in "real life." No casting on this so far.

The two series will join "Night Heat," "Admiral" and "In Person from the Palace," a previously-announced live Friday night contemporary music series headed by Bobby Coleman, that premieres June 12.

CBS will air five hours of programming from Philadelphia on Thursday, Sept. 17 saluting the 200th anniversary of the signing of the Constitution.

"We The People 200: The Celebration of the Bicentennial of the Con-

stitution of the United States" will include live coverage of a three-hour parade in Philadelphia starting at 9 a.m.

That will be followed by a two-hour primetime "black-tie gala" to be broadcast from that city's Convention Hall that evening starting at 9 p.m.

CBS also announced that this fall it's replacing "We The People," — three one-minute broadcasts celebrating the 200th anniversary of the Constitution — with a new series called "A Presidential Portrait," which will honor "the upcoming 200th anniversary of the establishment of the American presidency."

The portraits will be presented at 9-10 weeknights until 1989 and, says CBS, "incorporate historical footage, photographs, portraits and documents highlighting the character (oh, oh) and accomplishments of the 39 men who have held our nation's highest office."

Miniseries are getting shorter and fewer as production costs rise at all three networks. But they are still part of the program mix for the next few seasons, anyway.

Among miniseries announced by ABC recently for 1987-88, are the six-hour "Napoleon and Josephine: A Love Story," starring Armand Assante and Jacqueline Bisset; the four-hour "Elvis and Me," based on the book by Priscilla Presley; and

the five-hour "Onassis," the story of "the young Greek boy who grew up to be one of the world's most powerful men and love of some of the world's most beautiful women"...

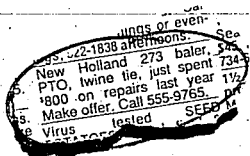

Plus the four-hour "Mario Puzo's The Fortunate Pilgrim," which stars Sophia Loren and Edward James Olmos in the story of a "strong-willed Italian immigrant who keeps her family together despite great obstacles and struggles to achieve the American dream"...
