## Beekeepers' suit packs \$2.5 million stinger

BOISE — Southern Idaho beekeepers say the federal and state governments didn't do a good job of controlling deadly pesticides sprayed over millions of acres of land in southern Idaho two years ago to kill grasshoppers.

As a result, they say in a U.S. District Court lawsuit here, they lost most of their bees by misdirected pesticides, and at least one season's honey production.

Farmers also suffered serious crop damage because bees weren't there to pollinate, the beekeepers claim.

Twenty-four beekeepers in nine southern Idaho counties filed the action against the federal and state governments and their departments of agriculture. Also named as defendants were 16 aircraft spraying companies from Idaho, Washington, Oregon, Arizona and Florida.

Two years ago, southern Idaho, along with

other areas across the country, was hit by a massive buildup of grasshoppers. About 6½ million acres was sprayed in Idaho, most of it federal land.

The beekeepers claim they suffered \$2,527,672 in damages, and ask another \$1 million in punitive damages.

Largest of the claims was filed by Clifton Dixon, Gooding County, who said he lost \$437,982, including \$399,000 in extended, but unspecified, damages.

Millet Apiaries, Owyhee County, said it lost \$402,540, including \$206,840 for colonies lost and re-established.

In all, honeybee growers said they suffered losses of \$1.9 million. Leafcutter bee losses were put at \$581,000. Leafcutter bees are used mainly for pollination.

Richard Rush, state director of agriculture, said the spraying two years ago was carried out in "an extremely urgent situation."

He said bees are always an area at risk when

there is a large spraying operation. "There were some losses," he said.

Rush said after the 6½ million acres sprayed in 1985, 600,000 acres were sprayed last year and it appears 300,000 to 400,000 acres will have to be sprayed this year.

One of the best ways to prevent bee losses, he said, is to avoid having to spray huge amounts of land.

Rush said starting last year, the federal-state spraying operation hired four bee experts to help keep growers fully advised of spraying operations.

"We're getting excellent cooperation from the beekeepers," he said. "We're hoping to run a program we both can live with."

The lawsuit alleges the governments were at fault because they did not spray early enough suit alleged, spraying with pesticides such as Sevin 4 or Malathion was inaccurate or uncontrolled with the result that bees some distance from the spraying area were killed.

## North grant of immunity receives OK

WASHINGTON — The congressional committee investigating the Iran-Contra affair voted Thursday to grant limited immunity from prosecution to their most important witness, Lt. Col. Oliver North, in order to force him to testify.

He is to be questioned in private beginning June 15 and could be summoned to testify in public as early as July 16. The committee left open, however, the question of whether North, a Marine officer who directed a private Iran-Contra network from the White House, will appear at the public hearings.

When North was summoned before Congress previously, he refused to answer questions on grounds that he might incriminate himself with his answers.

The committee had been under heavy pressure from independent Counsel Lawrence Walsh to forgo a grant of immunity for North because it would hamper any criminal prosecution he might be preparing.

The immunity decision was made outside the Senate Caucus Room, where moneyman Albert Hakim was undergoing a second day of sharp questioning about a special account he set up to provide benefits for North's family in case of North's death.

Senate committee counsel Arthur

L. Liman, trying to cast doubt on Hakim's contention that the \$200,000 fund was not a payoff to a U.S. government official, said, "This story that Col. North was not going to know who was offering to provide money to the family is pretty preposterous, isn't it?"

Hakim said he never told North about the fund. He said, "I know very well making kickbacks to American officials is illegal."

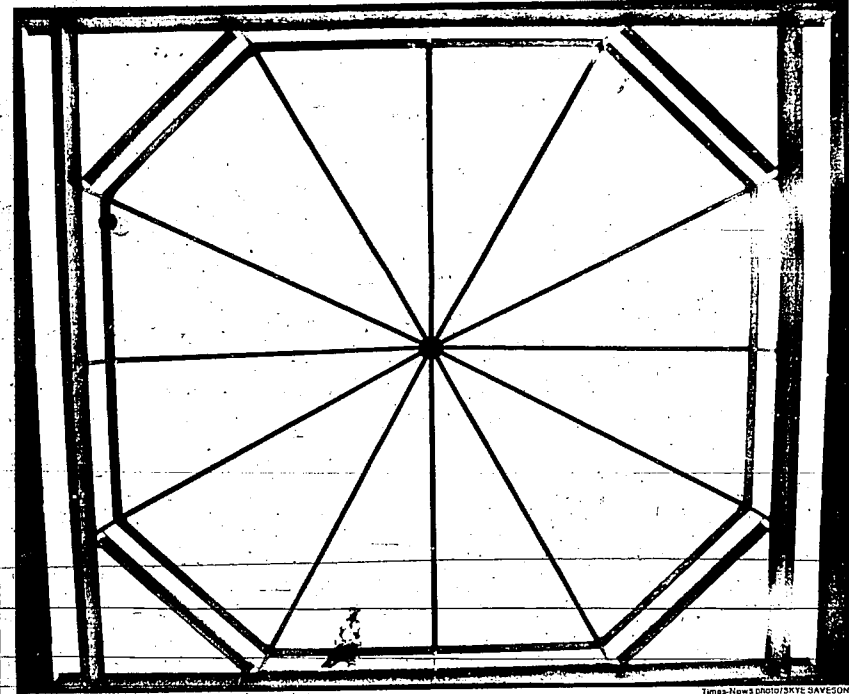
Hakim said the only person he told of the offer was his business partner, retired Maj. Gen. Richard Secord.

After the hearings concluded for the day, Sen. Paul Trible, R-Va., said committee accountants had found that Secord withdrew more than \$30,000 from his \$1.5 million account generated from the Iran arms sales and spent it on a sports car, an airplane and a trip to a "fat farm" with retired CIA agent Thomas

The finding appeared to contradict Secord's earlier testimony that he had forsworn any profits from the Iran venture and was in precarious personal financial straits.

"It raises further questions about the credibility of Mr. Secord," Trible said. Committee members, citing discrepancies between Secord's statements as leadoff witness a month ago and those of subsequent witnesses, have said they intend to

## Creator's daughter half of Ann Landers team

CHICAGO — Move over, buster, as Ann Landers might say, and make room for the new advice mavens.

After a three-month search, the Chicago Sun-Times on Thursday introduced the woman, and the man, who will replace the columnist in that newspaper.

Diane Crowley, 47, is a Longmeadow, Mass., attorney, former teacher and divorced mother of two. Her mother, Ruth Crowley, created the Ann Landers persona for her own Sun-Times advice column.

Her male counterpart is Wall Street Journal writer Jeff Zaslav, 28, who applied for the job to give a fresh angle to his story on the Sun-Times search for an in-house columnist after Landers

— moved to the rival Chicago Tribune.

After he survived the third cut, reducing a field of 11,000 to seven finalists, Zaslav sought advice about the job from — who else? — Eppie Lederer, who was a housewife when she won the Sun-Times' contest to find a new Ann Landers after Mrs. Crowley's death in 1955.

"She told me to be careful what you pray for because you just might get it," said Zaslav.

"Well, now I've got it, so either the other entrants were more careful with their prayers, or I was more reckless with mine."

Ms. Crowley called this "a wonderful day because I feel like I'm coming home. . . . This was the only job that would entice me back from my law to Chicago."

Ms. Lederer will keep the pen name Ann Landers for her column, which is published in

more than 1,100 newspapers. The Tribune now carries advice columns by Ms. Lederer and her twin sister, Pauline "Popp" Phillips, who writes as "Dear Abby."

Sun-Times editor Matthew Steiner said plans call for the new column to start in early July, although the format and possible syndication arrangements were uncertain.

The two most likely will write on alternate days, with Ms. Crowley's column called "Your Problems," and Zaslav's titled "All That Zazz."

Ms. Crowley said she will dispense "conventional advice," but Zaslav said he hoped to stray frequently from the beaten path.

"I've got dozens of ideas and I hope some of them will make you shake your head and say, 'This guy's off the wall.'"

## Doctors worried by AIDS dangers

WASHINGTON — Sixty-nine percent of hospital doctors believe they can get AIDS from their patients and one in four would refuse to treat AIDS patients if given a choice, two new surveys show.

One of the surveys, which were presented Thursday at the Third International Conference on AIDS, found that the stress connected with AIDS care was a special concern for doctors, said Dr. Molly Cooke of the University of California, San Francisco.

"It is the reverse of the usual tendency for women to report more job-related stress than their co-workers," Cooke said.

Nathan Link of the New York University School of Medicine reported that 42 percent of 422 hospital doctors surveyed would not continue to care for AIDS patients if given a choice.

Twenty-seven percent of doctors treating adults and 20 percent of pediatricians said they did not think it was unethical to refuse to care for AIDS patients. About one-third of each group thought they should be able to decide whether or not to care for AIDS patients.

Such attitudes "undermine the social contract" between doctors and patients, Link said, according to which doctors are pledged to provide care for anyone who needs it.

That sentiment was echoed in part by Surgeon General C. Everett Koop in his appearance on the "MacNeil-Lehrer NewsHour" television program. Koop said, however, that surgeons fit in a different category that's very difficult for a doctor to say and maintain that he's part of the Hippocratic tradition," said Koop. "I think there is one

group of doctors that are at very high risk, and we have to do something about them. . . . That is, surgeons."

A surgeon for 40 years, Koop told how he contracted Hepatitis-B after running a surgical needle through his hand. "Now if that had been AIDS, I'd be in the pipeline for death."

He said that hospital testing may come about as a result of the refusal of surgeons to operate unless they know how to test HIV-negative.

In other developments:

- Researchers reported the first known case of a dentist getting an AIDS infection through apparent on-the-job contact with AIDS patients. Dr. Robert S. Klein of Montefiore Medical Center in New York said the dentist had no other risk factors for AIDS. He was one of 121 dentists and hygienists surveyed.
- A researcher with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control said similarities between the spread of hepatitis and AIDS suggest that the AIDS virus may eventually infect 5 percent of all Americans, including 30 percent of the urban poor, and up to 75 percent of male homosexuals.
- The hepatitis-AIDS model was based on the assumption that people won't stop risky behavior that helps the virus to spread.
- Dr. Donald Francis also predicted that 20 percent of those infected will get the AIDS virus from heterosexual encounters, and transmission in an additional 30 percent will be unknown but presumed to be heterosexual.
- "A new AIDS virus" that is spreading slowly from Africa to nearby countries will reach the United States, but U.S. experts say it should not worsen the current epidemic.

## Demos at odds over budget

WASHINGTON — Disagreement among House Democrats on Thursday blocked a congressional compromise on a \$1 trillion fiscal 1988 budget that confronts President Reagan with higher taxes, trims his military spending request and protects domestic programs from sharp reductions.

Budget writers met informally through the day on a tentative compromise reached between Sen.

Lawton Chiles, D-Fla., chairman of the Senate Budget Committee, and Rep. William H. Gray-III, D-Pa., the House budget chairman.

But hopes for a settlement after House liberals said the plan didn't cut deeply enough into Reagan's defense buildup, at the expense of domestic priorities.

"Hopefully, they can work out something we can sign off on," said Rep. Marty Russo, D-Ill., who fought the proposal in what apparently, was

a heated closed-door session.

"I think it's do-able," said Rep. Buddy Mack Kay, D-Ill.

Reagan requested \$312 billion in military spending authority for next year. Actual cash outlays during the year beginning Oct. 1 would be about \$297 billion, because spending authority includes contracts paid out over longer periods of time.

The proposed House-Senate compromise called for a defense budget of \$300 billion in spending authority

## Allies won't join U.S. gulf strike

WASHINGTON — No U.S. allies will join in any American military retaliatory strike against Iran in attacks on U.S. ships in the Persian Gulf — a force so that American will really be in with what we say."

**Court upholds contempt ruling**  
**NEW YORK (AP)** — A federal appeals court Thursday upheld a contempt of court ruling against the nation's Roman Catholic bishops for refusing to release records demanded in a suit by a pro-abortion group.

In a 2-1 decision, the second Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals upheld a May 1986 ruling by U.S. District Judge Robert L. Carter that held the United States Catholic Conference and the National Conference of Catholic Bishops in civil contempt.

The court ordered the defendants and their attorneys to pay \$100,000-a-day fines when they balked at submitting records about their political activities and relationship with the Internal Revenue Service.

**Marcos wins round on assets**  
**SAN FRANCISCO (AP)** — A federal appeals court Thursday reversed a ruling freezing assets of Ferdinand and Imelda Marcos, saying the Philippine government had little chance of regaining \$1.5 billion it claims the couple stole.

By a 2-1 vote, a sixth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled in favor of the government of Corason Aquino that the U.S. investments were bought with proceeds of Marcos' looting of the Philippines during his reign raised political and foreign-policy questions that went beyond this nation's courts.

**Airline service rule proposed**  
**WASHINGTON (AP)** — The Transportation Department proposed a wide-ranging consumer protection rule for air travelers Thursday that calls for disclosure of on-time performance and possibly service standards for airlines.

The department said it was considering a variety of approaches aimed at providing travelers more accurate information about an airline's reliability and plans to develop a final rule probably by July.

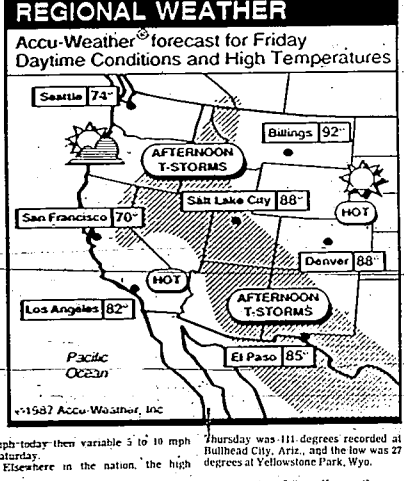
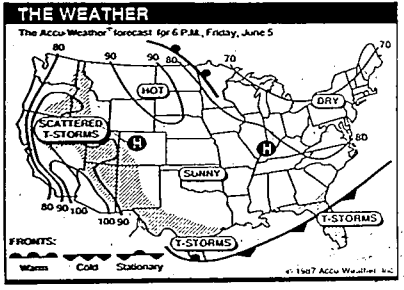
**Summary:**

**Gray may become top Marine**  
**WASHINGTON (AP)** — The secretary of the Navy has recommended Lt. Gen. Alfred M. Gray Jr. as the next commandant of the Marine Corps, but Defense Secretary Caspar W. Weinberger has yet to forward Gray's name to the White House for final approval, Pentagon officials said Thursday.

Gray, currently the commander of Atlantic Fleet Marine forces, would receive his fourth star and replace Gen. P.X. Kelley if he is nominated by the president and confirmed by the Senate.

The Pentagon officials, who agreed to discuss the matter only if not identified, said Navy Secretary James H. Webb had forwarded Gray's name to Weinberger within the last week or so. The sources said there was no reason to believe that Weinberger would not back Webb's choice, but added the nomination had yet to be sent to the White House.

**Khomeini forms hostage panel**  
**BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP)** — Iran's Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini has appointed a top-level committee to supervise dealings for the release of foreign hostages held in Lebanon, Ash-Shiraa magazine says.

"Negotiations with Iran about the foreign hostages in Lebanon would only be conducted through an official Iranian committee formed on instructions from Khomeini," the Lebanese magazine said.

# Heavy rains produce flooding from Oklahoma to N. Carolina

Heavy rain fell Thursday over already-drenched areas from Texas and Oklahoma to North Carolina, pushing rivers above flood stage and forcing new evacuations.

A flash flood and flood watch continued Thursday for the Texas hill country and much of south Texas, the National Weather Service said.

In Indian Springs, near the town of Anderson, northeast of Indianapolis, on Thursday after causing up to \$350,000 damage in the Muncie area as it crested at 11.9 feet overnight, nearly a foot over flood stage.

Other rivers above flood stage included the lower Nishnabotna River near Hamburg, Iowa, the lower Raccoon River near Ames, Iowa, the Washita River near Anadarko, Okla., and the Deep Fork River near Beggs, Okla.

and \$289.6 billion in cash outlays, an \$8 billion increase above current levels to cover the costs of inflation — if Reagan agreed to \$19.5 billion in tax increases, three times his own request.

If not, Pentagon spending would be approximately frozen at current levels with \$263 billion in outlays and less than \$290 billion in total budget authority.

Reagan had approved a little more than a freeze without tying it to the tax increases, and liberal lawmakers said the Senate plan was going far.

"It's such an insult to Democratic processes," said Rep. George Miller, D-Calif.

Despite higher taxes, the plan would leave a deficit of about \$125 billion, a six billion reduction from this year but still above the red-ink limit of \$108 billion set in the Gramm-Rudman budget-balancing law, based on estimates by the Congressional Budget Office.

Reagan's budget, which also missed the target, advocated a smaller tax boost, sale of government assets, deep cuts in domestic spending and a substantial boost for the military.

 The congressional budget resolution is a guideline for future spending and tax legislation and does not require the president's approval, but he can veto the bills it produces.

"I hope the president will be brought around to see the truth, the realism of the situation," said House Speaker Jim Wright, D-Texas, when asked about overcoming administration objections.

Congress had a self-imposed deadline of April 15 for completing the budget resolution, and June 15 for finishing action on the 13 annual spending bills.

Wright said Thursday that the House would begin action on the appropriations measures on June 22, and he hoped a half-dozen would be sent to the Senate by month's end.

**Counties may be in violation**

BOISE (AP) — Six Idaho counties may be in violation of new Environmental Protection Agency air quality standards expected to take effect July 10.

Idaho will have nine months from the effective date to develop anti-air pollution plans that will bring the counties into compliance, or face the threat of losing federal aid and bans on construction of facilities that would further pollute the air.

Ada, Shoshone, Bonner, Bannock and Power counties have at least a 95 percent chance in any given year of being in violation of the new standards, according to a report issued by the EPA. Caribou County has a 20 percent to 34 percent chance of being in violation. The report does not take into consideration recent wood smoke ordinances adopted by a number of communities, including Boise, Nampa, Emmett, Garden City and Ada County.

The EPA is adopting a revision of national clean air standards that tightens limits on small particles in the atmosphere. The standards will measure only particulates smaller than 10 microns — about one-tenth the diameter of a human hair. Wood smoke falls into that category.

Small particles are considered the most dangerous to human health because they can lodge in the lungs. Larger particles tend to be more easily exhaled and they get caught in the nasal passages.

**Accident kills Chubbuck boy**

POCATELLO (AP) — A 16-year-old Chubbuck boy died when he tried to regain control of a car he and a companion had abandoned on a steep hillside. Pocatello police said.

Capt. Jim Benham identified the youth as Michael Edward Jenkins. His companion, Travis Layton, age unavailability, Chubbuck, was uninjured, Benham said.

Benham said the youths were trying to drive a car up the side of the hill when it became stuck midway. The car began rolling down, and Jenkins attempted to jump in and regain control, the officer said. He was crushed by the car's front wheels, Benham said.

**Andrus plans to clear board**

LEWISTON (AP) — Although he will have to wait for another 13 months, Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus has vowed to gain control of the Public Employee Retirement System board of directors so he can finally return management of the \$1.2 billion fund to Idaho.

"I don't have confidence in those people, and I'm going to change them," Andrus said. "As far as I'm concerned, that's the end of the debate."

The confrontation began when the board last fall voted unanimously to shift management of the fund's investments from four Idaho banks to the Frank Russell Trust Co. of Tacoma, Wash.

In making the controversial move, the board cited the extremely poor earnings performance of the fund under the stewardship of the banks and the prospect of an increase of as much as \$41 million in earnings with the Russell Trust in control.

**Nampan dies of auto injuries**

CALDWELL (AP) — A Nampa man has died from injuries he suffered earlier this week when the car he was driving went out of control and rolled over just south of Caldwell, authorities reported.

The victim was identified as Dagoberto Martinez, 21. He suffered massive head injuries in the Tuesday accident and was flown to St. Alphonsus Regional Medical Center in Boise, where he died on Wednesday, officials said.

**Race, rain, drugs on agenda**

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — "Race relations, acid rain, consumer affairs and the war on drugs will be on the agenda, as well as a chat with U.S. Attorney General Edwin Meese III, when the National Association of Attorneys General meets at this north Idaho resort next week.

Attorneys general from 40 states are expected, along with Meese, the Soviet Union's minister of justice and a top prosecutor from Taiwan's high court.

Pending cases and current enforcement efforts will be discussed when Meese meets in closed session with the group Tuesday, said Chris Milliken, executive director of the association in Washington, D.C.

A closed meeting is scheduled Tuesday so the Soviet lawyers "feel more comfortable" and the attorneys general "get better answers," Ms. Milliken said.

Pending cases before the U.S. Supreme Court are expected to come up when former U.S. Solicitor General Rex Lee, now a law professor at Brigham Young University, speaks at a noon luncheon Wednesday.

Eugene Thomas of Boise, president of the American Bar Association, is to attend the meeting, as is the head of the American Trial Lawyers Association.

**Claim filed in man's death**

MOSCOW (AP) — A \$1-million tort claim has been filed against Latah County by the family of a Sandpoint man who died from a heart attack after allegedly being refused medical help during a court appearance.

The family of William Tolson, 35, contended that while he appeared in court for being behind in his child support payments he suffered a heart attack and was refused treatment by both court and county sheriff personnel.

Magistrate William Hammett said Tolson appeared in good health prior to the Dec. 3 hearing in Moscow, but during the brief hearing the magistrate questioned Tolson about his health condition after noting that Tolson appeared to be distressed.

Hammett found Tolson in contempt of court for failing to keep up with the support payments and ordered him to serve 150 days in jail. But the magistrate withheld the jail time to give Tolson 16 days to bring his account up to date and then released him on his own recognizance.

Tolson died later that day after returning to Sandpoint, the claim said.

**Use of procedures clarified**

BOISE (AP) — State agencies are being advised that they should use emergency purchases or contracts, skipping the usual bidding and contracting process, only if there is an actual emergency threatening life or property or significant loss of state resources.

The next session of the Idaho Legislature will be asked to clarify state laws which are unclear as to when emergency purchases and contracts can be used, says Public Works Director Anne Barker.

She presented the Permanent Building Fund Council on Thursday with legal guidelines prepared by Deputy Attorney General Michael Jones.

Jones said state laws don't contain specific authority for the public works director to use emergency purchase procedures, although officials said it's done frequently.

**NRA fires salvo at Andrus over stand**

POCATELLO (AP) — A National Rifle Association official says Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus misrepresented his group's position on a proposed Idaho hunting regulation when the governor slammed NRA leadership.

But two Fish and Game Department officials are backing Andrus' version of the controversy.

Andrus, in a speech here Monday to a Democratic Party gathering, blasted "NRA leadership, which he said has taken stands not necessarily to the benefit of Idaho outdoorsmen. He mentioned NRA op-

position to legislation limiting the use of hunting rifles to eliminate turret-mounted devices that could kill an elk from 2,000 yards away.

And, they say various people who claimed to be NRA representatives called commission members to say they opposed the regulation.

The conflicting accounts over what stand the NRA took on the controversial hunting regulation is another chapter in the on-going fight between Andrus and NRA leadership, which endorsed Republican David Leroy in last year's gubernatorial race.

The commission decided on the hunting rifle restriction because some hunters were using turret-mounted firearms capable of killing game from more than 2,000 yards away, the governor said.

"The NRA even opposed that (regulation)," he said.

But Judy said he told Lloyd Oldenburg, state wildlife manager, "We felt they were doing the wise thing and philosophically we felt they were doing the right thing. I don't know how Andrus came about the information that we were supporting (turret-mounted weapons)."

Oldenburg said he talked with Judy and that the NRA official told him "their constituents were at odds with what we were proposing. I relayed the message to the commis-

**State hopes to start prison work this fall**

BOISE (AP) — Barring unexpected problems, the state hopes to start construction of a new maximum security prison at Boise this fall.

By July 2, the state will ask the companies to prepare specific proposals. They will have 30 days to submit bids, Ms. Barker said.

By September, the five-member Permanent Building Fund Council hopes to award a contract to one of the three companies competing for what will be a \$20 million package of improvements in the state prison system.

Anne Barker, public works director, told the board on Thursday that all three companies competing for the project have decided to go to the second phase.

That means the companies will have to spend up to \$50,000 preparing plans and a proposal for the construction project, with the assurances they will receive the contract.

Competing for the project are Boise-based Morrison-Knudsen Co. Inc., Forest Phelps, Inc., Colo. and Fluor-Daniel, Irvine, Calif.

The state will select a national prison consulting company to help evaluate the bids, Ms. Barker said.

"We hope to keep politics out of the selection process" by having an outside company help make the evaluations, said Chairman Jerry Hess, Nampa.

**INEL could gain new reactor, official says**

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — The outgoing manager of the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory says U.S. capacity to produce weapons fuel is in a "very critical" position.

That may favor the INEL on two fronts, he said. One is the continued pursuit of the Special Isotope Separation project and the possible addition of a New Production Reactor at the site, says Troy Wade.

Wade, who has served as INEL manager since July 1983, will begin work Monday with DOE in Washington. He will work as the DOE's principal deputy assistant secretary for defense programs, a post now held by Donald Ofte, Ofte reports as INEL manager June 15.

Nick Aquilina, the site's deputy manager since 1976, is leaving to manage DOE's Las Vegas, Nev., office in July. His successor will be Bob Tiller, INEL's manager of special projects.

At a news conference here Thursday, Wade said selection of two NPR sites could begin within six months. Meanwhile, a boost in congressional funding could speed the SIS project by up to 18 months, although he says a faster deadline may be hard to meet.

Authorization committees in the House and Senate both favor construction of the NPR. The need for nuclear fuel could force construction of two separate NPR reactors, built at different national laboratories.

Wade said he is "fairly pleased" with the development, since it may enhance the INEL's chances of landing one NPR contract. The Savannah River Plant in South Carolina and the Hanford nuclear reservation in Washington state have been listed as possible NPR sites.

Former Secretary of Energy Donald Hodel earlier named the INEL as the preferred site for the NPR, before the project was postponed for budgetary reasons.

His recommendation remains the government's document of record, Wade says, although the INEL's preferred status for the SIS may change that.

Congress is currently debating the SIS budget for next year. In May the House boosted the Department of Energy's \$56 million budget request to \$116 million. If the money is added to the DOE budget, it could accelerate SIS construction, currently slated to begin by 1989.

However, Wade warns that "giant engineering steps" must be taken in order to hasten construction. Testing of SIS technology is continuing at California's Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory, but has not yet been conducted on a production scale.

The need for nuclear fuel has intensified, due to problems at Hanford and Savannah River. Hanford's N Reactor has been shut down for several months. Congress has banned DOE from spending money to prolong its lifespan. Savannah River plants are producing weapons fuel at 50 percent of capacity.

Even progress in U.S. Soviet arms talks — a development Wade says is heartening — does not take away the urgency of SIS and NPR. Production capacity, still needs to be boosted to replenish weapons fuel in existing warheads.

"The stockpile is evolving all the time," he said.

# Reagan says stage set for missile cuts across Europe, Asia

VENICE, Italy (AP) — President Reagan moved Thursday to convert next week's summit meeting of seven Western leaders into a platform for the elimination of hundreds of American and Soviet nuclear missiles and halted West Germany's endorsement of a key arms control provision.

In a statement issued from the 17th-century Villa Capra, where Reagan is staying, he declared that NATO unity was "a major success story" that had set the stage for a historic arms control accord.

The Western allies will consider the arms treaty at next week's Venice summit and at the conference of NATO foreign ministers that will follow.

In remarks read by his spokesman, Marlin Fitzwater, Reagan said there were still issues to resolve before U.S. and Soviet negotiators could wrap up the treaty and move toward a third summit between Reagan and Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev.

"It's probably fair to say this moves us a little closer, but we have not discussed specifics with the Soviets," Fitzwater said of a summit that would likely occur in August.

"The United States has protested in China its delivery of two shipments of Silkworm antiship missiles to Iran. The weapons are considered a danger to Western oil deliveries through the Strait of Hormuz."

Fitzwater faced a standing-room crowd of reporters at the Excelsior Hotel.

Reagan himself had met with retiring Federal Reserve Chairman Paul Volcker on Monday and asked Volcker to reconsider his decision to leave.

Reagan will be reviewing data on Japanese computer chip sales as he considers whether to lift \$300 million in sanctions imposed because of Tokyo's alleged violation of an earlier agreement.

The news briefing was dominated by word from Bonn that West Germany will be joining the other European allies in accepting a sharp reduction in missiles.

One hurdle involves the always-thorny question of verification. Some U.S. intelligence experts want to exclude some U.S. intelligence installations from any on-site inspection programs that would result from arms control accords with Moscow.

They believe the risk of allowing Soviet inspectors at U.S. facilities could outweigh advantages of having broad access to Soviet military sites.

Fitzwater said Reagan was analyzing that problem.

"We are working in Geneva to see if the Soviets are willing to accept the kind of verification measures that will be needed," Reagan said in an interview with ASA, the Italian news agency. "Of course, we have no way of knowing how long this will take."

In the quiet days before the summit, the White House mood seemed upbeat, despite hovering gray clouds above Venice and a two-hour demonstration on the temporary presidential villa by some 100 Italian opponents of capital punishment.

## Britain shuts Iran consulate, orders 5 diplomats to leave

LONDON (AP) — Britain closed an Iranian consulate Thursday and ordered five diplomats to leave the country after failing to get an apology or explanation of the abduction and beating of Britain's No. 2 diplomat in Tehran last week.

The Iranian consulate in Manchester was closed and the five diplomats employed there were given a week to leave Britain.

The Iranian Embassy in London and its 19 employees were not affected by the order.

Foreign Secretary Sir Geoffrey Howe cautioned Iran not to retaliate against the 250 Britons living in Iran, including Edward Chaplin, who was beaten and abducted for 24 hours last week.

But Iran's top diplomat in London, Charge d'Affaires Mohammad Akhondzadeh Basti, said the sanctions were "very, very serious" and said he thought there could be countermeasures from Tehran "in three or four days."

The diplomats ordered to leave include Ali Qassemi, a vice consul who was to have appeared in court in Manchester next Thursday on charges of shoplifting three pairs of socks and a plastic purse worth \$12, reckless driving and resisting arrest.

Basti was summoned to the Foreign Office, where permanent under-secretary Sir Patrick Wright

Wright as telling Basti "that any ill-for-til retaliation would be not only totally unjustified but would give rise to further serious consequences for British-Iran relations."

## S. African president gets criticism, citizenship during visit

SEBOKENG, South Africa (AP) — In a rare visit Thursday to the black townships that spawned the strongest challenge to white control of South Africa, President P.W. Botha received honorary citizenship and some polite criticism.

Both came from a black mayor who invited him despite widespread protest from anti-apartheid activists.

It was Botha's first visit to Sebokeng and Sharpeville, where anti-government riots in September 1984 sparked nationwide black unrest and a rent boycott that has spread to more than 50 such townships.

There were no disturbances Thursday, and the large force of soldiers and policemen guarding Botha let thousands of curious on-

## Soviets say young pilot had help

HAMBURG, West Germany (AP) — Soviet officials suspect Western intelligence agencies helped plan a young West German pilot's flight to Moscow's Red Square, a newspaper reported Thursday.

"They are 100 percent certain that Matthias Rust was put up to it (the flight) by a group or organization to damage the Soviet Union," the mass-circulation Bild newspaper said, citing Kremlin sources.

"They question him morning, noon and evening, for hours," the Hamburg paper said in a front-page story.

Rust, 19, flew more than 400 miles to Moscow from Helsinki, Finland, on May 28, landing a small Cessna near the Kremlin wall. Two days later, the Soviet Communist Party's ruling Politburo dismissed Defense Minister Marshal Sergei Sokolov and fired Marshal Alexander Koldunov, head of the air defense system.

Rust was taken into Soviet custody shortly after landing and has since been allowed just one meeting with West German representatives.

Although Rust has not said whether anyone helped him with his flight, his answers to questions have made the Soviets suspect he did not act alone, Bild said, quoting an unnamed "Kremlin informant."

## India airlifts relief supplies

BANGALORE, India (AP) — Indian air force planes escorted by Mirage fighter jets parachuted relief supplies to Sri Lanka's besieged Tamil minority Thursday, one day after the island's navy drove off unarmed Indian fishing boats laden with food and medicine.

In Colombo, the Sri Lankan government called India's airlift "a naked violation of our sovereignty... and territorial integrity."

The Indian transport planes dropped supplies on the Jaffna Peninsula in northern Sri Lanka, a Tamil-dominated area where the Sri Lankan army began a major offensive against strongholds of Tamil separatist guerrillas 10 days ago.

"We have no military or other means of preventing this outrage," the Sri Lankan government statement said. "We will take this up in an appropriate forum."

Sri Lankan President Junius R. Jayawardene sent a message Thursday morning to Indian Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi requesting a meeting to discuss how India's aid

could be received by Sri Lanka.

Instead of agreeing to a meeting, India sent five Soviet-built Antonov-32 transports and four Mirage-2000 escorts from this southern India city at 4 p.m. to drop 25 tons of food and medicine on the Jaffna Peninsula.

India said it informed the Sri Lankan Embassy of the airlift at 2 p.m.

Tamil militants began a guerrilla war four years ago to obtain a separate homeland for the ethnic group in northern Sri Lanka, where most Tamils live. About 6,000 people have been killed since.

India, which has three times more Tamils than Sri Lanka's total population, has played an ambiguous role in the conflict. It often has acted as mediator, but Tamil rebels also have

exile headquarters in southern India's Tamil Nadu state.

On Thursday, Sri Lankan gunboats refused passage to a fleet of 19 fishing craft carrying 38 tons of relief supplies escorted by an Indian coast guard vessel carrying journalists and Red Cross officials.

### She slept, but not well

VENICE, Italy (AP) — Nancy Reagan didn't sleep as well as the president on the special, bed-tilted here from Portugal for their suite in the Villa Condulmer, the first lady's press secretary said Thursday.

The Reagans arrived from Washington late Wednesday night and flew by helicopter to the secluded 17th-Century villa 12 miles from Venice, where Reagan went to sleep at 1:30 a.m. and got up at 9 a.m.

Asked how Mrs. Reagan slept, her press secretary Elaine Crispin said: "Not as well as he — but she never does."

The first day of the Reagans' four-day visit before next Monday's summit opening didn't have the magical romance that Venice conjures up for tourists with fewer security problems.

The day was gray and overcast, alternating between drizzle and heavy rain. Instead of a quiet dinner for two overlooking Venice's Grand Canal or a romantic boat ride with a singing gondolier, the Reagans stayed at the villa and invited their staff to join them in watching a John Wayne movie.

The Reagans brought along some of their favorite videos, Mrs. Crispin said.

VENICE, Italy (AP) — President Reagan may lift at least part of the \$300 million in U.S. sanctions on Japanese electronics products as a summit goodwill gesture, despite a deep split within his Cabinet on the issue, administration officials suggested on Thursday.

Key members of Congress indicated they oppose such a move without "indisputable evidence" of Japanese progress on computer chip pricing. The Cabinet split indicates the evidence may not be compelling.

Data collected by U.S. trade officials at Reagan's behest have failed to give him the hard evidence he sought to justify lifting the sanctions, said the officials, who spoke only on the condition of anonymity.

However, the president might go ahead and lift roughly half the sanctions anyway if he concludes the Japanese have been making a good-faith effort to comply with a 1986 agreement to stop selling computer chips at bargain-basement prices in foreign markets.

Reagan slapped the 100 percent tariffs on Japanese televisions, computers and power tools on April 17 to protest what he claimed was Japanese violation of that agreement, which called for Japan to both stop "dumping" computer chips, or semiconductors, and to give U.S. chip makers more access to Japanese markets.

Presidential spokesman Martin Fitzwater told reporters that the information gathered so far has been sent to the president without a recommendation from his Cabinet.

"It is the kind of decision that requires analysis, but also subjective thought," Fitzwater said.

He said that, while a decision during the summit still seemed unlikely, "the president can decide any time he wants to." Reagan had earlier said he hoped that the issue could be resolved before the summit.

The administration sources said that Reagan's key advisers were deeply divided on the issue — with Commerce Secretary Malcolm Baldrige and U.S. Trade Representative Clayton Yeutter urging that the tariffs remain in place and Secretary of State George Shultz and Treasury Secretary James A. Baker III arguing for them to be lifted.

## Truck thief takes tigers, too, then vanishes into urban jungle

NEW YORK (AP) — It's a jungle out there, and on Thursday it was more so than usual in New York as an unsuspecting thief nabbed a van carrying two white tigers in midtown Manhattan.

The van, its costly cargo intact, was recovered hours later in the Bronx, after a frantic, televised appeal by illusionists Siegfried and Roy.

The rare tigers, worth \$125,000 and insured by Lloyds of London for \$2 million, were pronounced "fantastic" by owner Roy, who was reunited with the 10-month-old, 110-pound cats at a police station after speeding to the inner-city neighborhood in a limousine.

Appropriately, the cats' hectic day turned into a media circus, and residents who thought they had seen it all were bemused at having tigers in their inner-city neighborhood.

"Well, I've been happy," one woman said while leaning out her window. "The tigers are outside. I'm inside."

A young man in the scene said what the Bronx needs is more police in the streets, not tigers.

Police had been searching street by street and issued a nationwide alarm for the rental vehicle, which had been on the way to a WGBS-TV studio to deliver the felines to "The Morning Program."

Siegfried and Roy appeared on the show without

the tigers, and issued a plea for their return.

"It's our soul, it's our heart, it's what we're living for," said Roy, voice cracking. "And on the way here to the studio the car has been stolen with the babies in it."

After a police officer at a drug stakeout found the van at about 11:30 a.m. Roy said of the day's events: "It began as a nightmare and ended gloriously."

The popular magic act recently signed a \$57 million, five-year contract to perform at the Golden Nugget in Las Vegas.

The truck's two drivers and a trainer had parked it shortly after 6:15 a.m. to go to a diner in midtown Manhattan, down the block from a police station, said Capt. Michael Gardner. While in the restaurant they noticed the vehicle pulling away but could not catch it.

Police said they think the person who took off with the yellow Hertz truck had no idea the caged tigers were inside. No suspects had been found Thursday.

The animals — Vegas and Siegray, a female and a male — had been stored at John F. Kennedy International Airport since Tuesday, and after their appearance on "The Morning Show" were to leave today for exhibition at an amusement park at Branh, West Germany, according to police and a spokesman for the entertainers.

## Laxalt, newspapers to settle libel suit on skimming story

WASHINGTON (AP) — Paul Laxalt and the McClatchy Newspapers agreed Thursday to settle the former Nevada senator's \$250 million libel suit with a public statement skimming at a Laxalt family-owned casino in the 1970s.

Both sides said they won the 2½-year legal battle.

Laxalt, a close friend of President Reagan, declared victory and said the settlement frees him to pursue the 1988 Republican presidential nomination.

"These people spent millions of dollars in this case, they went everywhere... they came up with zip," Laxalt said at a news conference in his Washington law offices. "Today marks the end of a very trying experience. At long last, the Bee has accepted my demands."

Across the continent, C.K. McClatchy, president and editor of the newspaper group, said the papers won. He said the three California papers are not retracting their Nov. 1, 1983, story saying the Internal Revenue Service had evidence of skimming at the Ormsby House hotel-casino in Carson City, Nev., when it was owned by the Laxalt family.

"We are the winner, as far as I'm concerned," McClatchy said at a San Francisco news conference. "If he wants to say that we're receding to any demands, it's a free country and he can say that but it's not true. ... We have not retracted, we have not apologized and we have not paid any damages."

"Regardless of what the senator says to further his efforts in his campaign, we are not backing away from anything we said in the news story."

The newspapers also agreed that a panel of retired judges would determine whether and how much the Laxalt family owned it in the 1970s. The story said Laxalt had received help to finance purchase of the

casino from a Chicago financier whom the newspaper called a "stock manipulator" and "mob associate." It also said the IRS probe was never pursued.

Skimming is the illegal diversion of cash from a business to evade taxes, and often to divert the money to other, perhaps illegal purposes. Casinos which handle millions of dollars in cash, are prime targets for skimming.

A joint statement issued by Laxalt and the papers contained this conclusion:

"Extensive discovery taken in this libel action has not shown that there was in fact a skim at the Ormsby House and has produced no evidence persons acting on his behalf granted anyone the right to skim the casino in exchange for improper or illegal financing. Nor has extensive discovery taken in this libel action produced any evidence that Laxalt acted to hinder or defeat any government investigation."

"That's complete, total vindication of a good man," said James Beasley of Philadelphia, Laxalt's attorney.

"The legal people tell me this is clearly a retraction," Laxalt said. "They will deny that. But you know as Barry Goldwater says, 'If it looks like a duck and it walks like a duck and sounds like a duck; it's got to be a duck.' That's essentially what we have here."

McClatchy said the newspaper would do the same story again, "given the same conditions and opportunity." He also said he believes "the primary reason Senator Laxalt filed this suit was to intimidate other news agencies from filing similar stories."

## Varied advice for Greenspan

WASHINGTON (AP) — Alan Greenspan was offered a wealth of free but conflicting advice Thursday on what he should do once he takes over from Paul Volcker as head of the Federal Reserve Board.

One group of economists argued that Greenspan should decisively tighten monetary policy and send interest rates higher in order to ward off a dangerous inflationary spiral. But other economists urged looser credit conditions in order to keep the economy out of recession.

The contradictory opinions pointed up the headaches and uncertainties awaiting Greenspan once he is confirmed by the Senate and takes over what is considered the country's most important economic policy post.

The economists were testifying before a House Banking subcommittee which oversees Fed monetary policies. The panel wanted to know whether the recent uptick in inflation posed a danger to the country.

Consumer prices, which rose at a 2½-year-low of 1½ percent in 1986, have been rising at a much higher 6 percent rate so far this year, due in part to a big drop in the value of the dollar, which has pushed up the costs of imports.

Some of the economists, Lawrence Kudlow and Donald Ratajczak, said the rise in inflation was indeed cause for concern.

## U.S. declines to join suit over boosters

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Justice Department declined Thursday to join a lawsuit alleging that Morton Thiokol Inc. defrauded the government in building rocket boosters for the ill-fated Challenger space shuttle.

The \$2 billion suit was filed Jan. 28 on behalf of U.S. taxpayers by Roger Boisjoly, a former Morton Thiokol engineer who charged that the company knowingly provided the National Aeronautics and Space Administration with defective solid rocket motors.

Boisjoly brought the suit under the False Claims Act, which allows private parties to sue on behalf of the government and gives the government the right to join the action.

The Justice Department said Thursday "there is not sufficient basis" to enter the case at this time, but noted in a statement that it could intervene later "upon a showing of good cause."

Documents in the suit unsealed recently by a court clerk revealed in April that the FBI was conducting a criminal investigation of fraud allegations brought by company employees in Utah.

Justice Department spokeswoman Amelia L. Brown declined to say whether the criminal investigation had been closed or was continuing.

Robert N. Levin, an attorney for Boisjoly, said he was surprised by the Justice Department's decision. "We intend to continue the suit," he added.

## Ground-breaking's today on CSI fitness trail

TWIN FALLS — The Twin Falls Rotary Club will hold a ground-breaking ceremony today at 3 p.m. for the College of Southern Idaho Fitness Trail, a 2.1 mile walking and jogging track being built by the club as a community service project.

The ceremony, to be held in the Vo-Tech parking lot at the northeast corner of campus, is open to the public. The first phase of construction on the trail will start either that afternoon or Saturday morning, said Rotary spokesman Tom Ashenbrenner.

The first step will be to strip away sod from the two-mile path in eight-foot-wide pieces, he said. Wright Sod Farm is donating

equipment and labor for that phase of the work.

The second phase will be to level out the path. The Army Reserve 21st Engineer Battalion, Company D, will volunteer their labor and heavy equipment for the second phase, he said.

Construction of the trail will be under the direction of the college maintenance department, but the bulk of the labor will hopefully come from community volunteers, Ashenbrenner said. Some CSI summer work study student crews and government grant workers will assist in the construction.

"Rotary is asking other organizations in the community to volunteer labor for construction of the exercise stations and the trail. So far, a list of volunteers has not been 'firmed

up," he said.

The trail should be finished by late August and the most likely date for the kick-off celebration is September 1, he added.

The bark-covered track and 10 exercise stations are being built entirely with donated funds, material and labor. Rotary has been collecting monetary donations since November of 1986 and now has the needed amount of \$50,000 to spend on the trail, Ashenbrenner said.

The trail will have a small loop running along both sides of the coulee on the eastern side of campus and a larger loop around Frontier Park and the Expo Center. Exercise stations will be situated on the small loop and the large loop will be only a jogging or walking path.

The trail, as well as the activity areas, will be on a four-inch surface of bark chips. The chips provide a softer surface than is sometimes used and will be easier on walkers' feet and joints, but may require more maintenance, said Karl Klein, head of the CSI physical education department.

Exercise structures and signs for the trail's activity stations have been purchased from Fit-Trail, a North Carolina organization, and are on their way, Ashenbrenner said.

Other materials, such as the redbud chips, have all been purchased locally, he added.

The path will combine two trails designed by Fit-Trail: the Seniors Walking System and the Jogging System for basic fitness.

Eight of the 40 exercises to be located on the trail are designed especially for seniors, and the other 32 will be aimed at younger fitness enthusiasts.

The materials from Fit-Trail come with a five-year warranty against breakage, including vandalism.

There will be two starting points on the trail, one located by the parking lot of the northern Vo-Tech building and one located by the library annex at the south end of campus.

Rotary Club will be holding a community-wide "Name the Trail" contest during the month of July, Ashenbrenner said. A \$100 cash award will be given to the person whose name suggestion is chosen for the trail.

## Live wire shocks boy at Burley city park

BURLEY — A 9-year-old baseball player was injured Wednesday night in an accident at a city-owned baseball diamond in Snake Park.

Jonathan Tilley, son of Irvin and Janet Tilley of Burley, was treated and released from Cassia Memorial Hospital Wednesday night. Tilley suffered electrical shock and two breaks in his left arm above the wrist, his parents said.

The parents said he was injured after sitting on a metal-roofed baseball dugout. When he tried to get down he touched an adjacent backstop that had 110 volts of electricity running through it, they said.

A live wire had fallen on a guide wire supporting the backstop, causing the backstop to carry the electrical current, said Don Hill, supervisor of the Burley electrical department.

The boy fell to the ground, injuring his arm, his parents said.

Irvin Tilley alleges that the city had received complaints about electrical problems at the Salmon River baseball diamonds prior to the accident. "I am totally ticked," he said Thursday. "The city is darn lucky nobody's been electrocuted before or killed."

Irvin Tilley and his family operate the Burley Amateur Baseball Association's food booth at the park, and said some parents had made the city aware of sparks that were seen around the first base side of the diamond for several days prior to the accident.

Kim Winn, vice president of the Snake River baseball league, said he discovered sparks in an electrical box near a light pole at the park Thursday and Friday of last week. He said he called the Parks and Recreation Department and informed them of the problem.

Hill said that the problem Winn reported had been checked and fixed before Wednesday's accident occurred, and was in another area of the park.

Winn's complaint was "unrelated completely," he said.

Hill said he could not comment "at this time" about Tilley's allegation that others have reported electrical problems in the area where the accident occurred. He said that the electric lines in question had had routine maintenance. The 110 volt wire fell "due to wear and age," thus contacting the backstop—guide wire, he said.

City workers fixed the problem Wednesday night following the incident and repaired ground wires throughout the park Thursday, he said.

Irvin described his son as doing OK.

## Fish research lab expands facility to study nutrition

HAGERMAN — The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is widening its research into production of trout, salmon and other species as it opens a \$35,000 expansion of its Tunison Laboratory of Fish Nutrition at Hagerman this weekend.

A new main laboratory built this winter will broaden studies into fish feeding, said Robert Smith, station director and the only nutrition researcher on staff.

The facility, located south of Hagerman on the grounds of the Hagerman National Fish Hatchery, will be dedicated at 10 a.m. Saturday by top FWS fisheries research officials.

The Tunison Laboratory studies methods of feeding fish for best weight gain and most beneficial nutrients.

The new laboratory contains 200 research tanks for growing fish, twice the number in the 31-year-old lab being replaced. The project also has captured a third source of water, Smith said. The lab uses 50 degree water from springs flowing out of the walls of the Snake River Canyon.

Modern circulation systems mix water at different temperatures and feeding systems allow precise mixing of various ingredients, such as soybean and cotton meals.

The Hagerman station currently confines most of its research to cold-water, rainbow trout and steelhead salmon. New technology probably will extend the studies to

other species at different temperatures, Smith said Thursday.

The station's larger research capacity also is designed to serve one or two more nutrition scientists, he said.

The new nutrition lab is the research hub of the complex, which includes a chemistry lab and a workshop. The previous nutrition lab will be modified as a chemical lab, as well.

The lab obtains fish eggs from FWS hatcheries and releases mature fish into Idaho streams, Smith said. In the past, it has produced 50,000 fish in about 10 projects a year.

The expansion is a sign of increased government interest in production for both sports fisheries and aquaculture. Research from the Hagerman station and a sister Tunison Laboratory in Cortland, N.Y., is published for use by government hatcheries and by commercial producers.

The work makes it possible to raise fish cheaper and, competition being what it is, it makes the price of fish cheaper," Smith said. Government hatcheries also can raise more fish for a dollar when growing them for recreational fisheries, he said.

The Tunison Lab is located along Fish Hatchery Road south of Hagerman just north of the Snake National Fish Hatchery.

Dedicating the nutrition laboratory on Saturday will be the associate director for FWS research fisheries and the scientific director for the Tunison Laboratory.

TWIN FALLS — A District Court judge has recommended that a jury verdict granting over \$350,000 in damages to James and Jeron Smallwood of Jerome in their suit against Dr. Carol N. Dick, a Twin Falls radiologist, be increased to just over \$1 million.

Judge Daniel Hurbutt of the 5th Judicial District in Twin Falls heard the case several weeks ago. The judge reviewed post-trial motions from both the plaintiffs and the defendant and recommended increasing the \$356,714.12 award for the Smallwoods to \$1,033,530.

The court's decision also states that if the plaintiffs do not choose to accept this larger amount, their motion for a new trial is granted.

In his decision, Hurbutt pointed

out the total figure he is recommending takes into consideration a \$375,000 settlement the couple received in the 1982 out-of-court settlement with the medical doctors originally named in the suit. With this amount already paid, the Smallwoods may elect to take an additional \$658,000 in damage and expense benefits or bring their case back into court for another trial.

The Smallwoods filed a motion for a new trial on the basis that the original damage award was unreasonably small.

Smallwood and his wife brought the suit against Dr. Dick and several medical doctors after Smallwood was injured in a traffic accident in October of 1981. Defense witnesses testified that Smallwood was given therapy and allowed to move about including walking to the bathroom.

## Grand jury concludes with 20 indictments

TWIN FALLS — A three-day state grand jury session ended Tuesday in Twin Falls County prosecutor's staff, concluded Thursday afternoon in Twin Falls with about 20 indictments issued in connection with drug-related cases.

The names of those indicted will be revealed after the individuals have been notified.

The grand jury inquiries opened Monday behind closed doors in the Twin Falls County Judicial Building to consider a number of local complaints.

County prosecutor K-Ellen Baxter said the purpose of calling the grand jury was largely to save time and money.

She said such jury sessions eliminate the need for long and costly preliminary hearings. The indictments that were issued have been sealed and will be unsealed on motion from the prosecutor's staff when those named have been

notified and summoned into court.

"These people will be called directly into district court for arraignments, eliminating the need for lengthy testimony in preliminary hearings," she said. "We believe this is an effective way of handling a number of cases since it shortens the time and costs the taxpayers less money. It is also less of a strain on the judicial system."

For example, one preliminary hearing may run for several days at a cost to the county for attorney and court services for each hearing. By utilizing the grand jury method, a half-dozen or more cases can be heard in a single day, Baxter added, that there are no public defender costs required since the defendants do not appear in the proceedings.

Since the grand jury was a state court rather than federal, she said, it could be convened in Twin Falls before local jurors.

Deputy prosecutors, Joel Horton and J. Scott James, presented the cases for the prosecution, she added.

## Vollmer: Twin Falls, businesses ready to form development agency

TWIN FALLS — Mayor Doug Vollmer says government officials and the Twin Falls business community are ready to create a professional development agency to promote the city's economy.

"We can't afford not to do it," he said Thursday after a consultant from nationally known Fatus Co. of Chicago recommended an aggressive search for new industry.

Ronald O. Decker, a vice president for the site location firm, said the Twin Falls community needs an organized thrust to attract new companies and to retain existing businesses.

"Really, no strong economic development program exists here who would see in the Midwest or the Southeast," Decker said.

He met Thursday with council members and representatives from the Greater Twin Falls Area Chamber of Commerce to deliver the final report for an economic development strategy which has been in the making for almost 1 1/2

years.

In its first phase, the study assessed the city's assets and abilities in recruiting industry. In the last three phases arriving this week, it has homed in on target industries, developed a marketing campaign and advised a long-term plan for boosting business.

The non-profit economic development agency should become the single business recruiting force for the Twin Falls area; the consultant said. It also could represent Jerome, which has sites with nearby access to Interstate 84 that could be stretched to include other Twin Falls County communities.

While backing a development commission, Vollmer balked Thursday at the \$120,000 start-up budget recommended by Fatus. He said the budget, which would pay a director \$40,000 a year in salary and benefits, could be cut back significantly.

Council members have not yet examined the study in depth and will not take any immediate action on the recommendations, which arrived in draft form.

The Twin Falls hunt should be narrowed to

plants ranging from 50 to 300 employees, Decker said later in an interview. Larger industries, however, want a bigger pool of workers than the area can provide, and smaller ones may be uneconomical to pursue actively.

Fatus also suggested searching out companies in growth industries such as plastics, manufacturing, surgical and medical instruments, frozen foods distribution and insurance. They could capitalize on the area's labor force yet not be deterred by Twin Falls' distance from many national markets, Decker indicated.

The economic agency, tentatively dubbed the Twin Falls Economic Development Commission, would spot companies and court them with brochures or personal contacts. Information should include descriptions of specific industrial sites, Decker said. The agency also would prospect for interest with advertisements in industry publications.

The selling of Twin Falls should stress an on-site look by a company executive, he said. "If a company cannot be persuaded to send someone

The fracture was not diagnosed by the medical doctors or by Dr. Dick, who held the X-rays at the time of initial treatment, they said. Witnesses for Dr. Dick testified that the X-rays that were requested by the doctors did not show the fractures and the physicians did not ask for additional X-rays.

Smallwood collapsed and fell to the hospital floor while walking to the bathroom and it was then determined that his spine had been fractured in the accident. As a result, he is confined to a wheelchair and has lost the use of his legs. The law grants the court the right to review a jury verdict on its nature and often make its own determination for a comparison. In that comparison, Hurlbutt said, the jury's award fell far short of what the court determined the paraplegic Jerome must deserve.

Judge Hurlbutt based his calculation on past and future medical and rehabilitation expenses, loss of wage earning ability, and other general costs, including constant care and assistance from his wife and loss of consortium. He also calculated benefits for pain and suffering at \$24,000, which he included in the \$1,033,530 total figure. The judge granted a request from the defendants to revise the amount of the prior settlement made by the doctors and hospital, which was paid in cash and annuities. The shares assigned to those previous defendants now include cash payments of \$50,000 by Dr. Kendall Street, and \$50,000 by Dr. Carl Brontrager, Dr. Harry Brumbach, and Magle Valley Regional Medical Center, and an annuity benefits of \$75,000 by the latter three defendants. In the original settlement this annuity amounted to \$84,000.

# Moses loses for first time in 10 years

122-race winning streak

MADRID, Spain (AP) — Edwin Moses' 122-race winning streak, the longest in the history of track, ended Thursday when fellow American Danny Harris beat him in the 400-meter hurdles.  
Moses — the world record-holder with a time of 47.02 seconds, last lost on Aug. 26, 1977 in West Berlin, when he was beaten by West Germany's Harald Schmid.  
Harris, 21, won Thursday in 47.56 at an international meet. Moses finished second in 47.69, followed by another American, Nate Page, in 50.12.  
"I ran a good race and the guy that beat me is 10 years younger and ran the race of his life," Moses said Thursday night. "It's very early in

the season for me to be running in Europe. I'm not as sharp as I would be normally. This is one of my best times for so early in the season. I'm not disappointed at all with the race.  
Moses led over the two first hurdles but Harris took the lead at the fifth hurdle and stayed in front the rest of the way.  
Moses encountered trouble at the 10th and last hurdle.  
"I hit the tenth hurdle and that really cost me the race," Moses said. "I expect to do much better. He was very lucky to win the race. He built up an early lead. There's probably no other person in the world who could run this time."  
Moses tried to recover after hit-

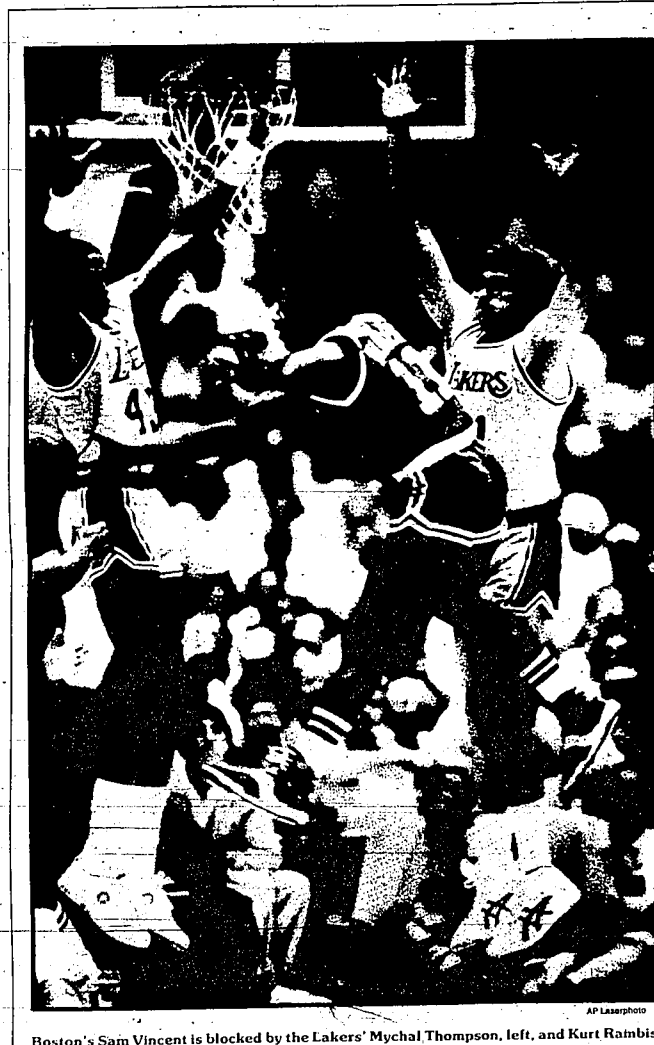
ting the hurdle but couldn't.  
"He moved out slightly," Moses said of Harris. "I came back toward the end but there was not enough time."  
Moses said he would return to his home in Newport Beach, Calif., and next run in the TAC national championships at San Jose, Calif. on June 22-27.  
"I'm pretty sure I'm looking for a world record," Moses said. "If I run as well as I can, I don't think he'll be able to beat me in the future."  
It was the first meeting between Moses and Harris since the 1984 Olympics when they ran 1-2.  
The 31-year-old Moses had won 107 consecutive first times — and 15 preliminaries since losing to Schmid.

He had won all three of his previous races this year, in Columbus, Ohio; Princeton, N.J. and Turin, Italy.  
Harris, born in Torrance, Calif., was a three-time NCAA champion at Iowa State. He won the 400-meter title at the NCAA outdoor championships in 1984, 1985 and 1986 and was ranked in the world behind fellow Americans Moses and Andre Phillips in the most recent world rankings.  
Harris, who went to high school in Brentwood, Tenn., set the national high school record in the 300-meter hurdles in 1983, then broke the world junior record in the 400-meter hurdles five times, including a best of 48.07.  
During three years at Iowa State,

training under assistant coach Steve Lynn, Harris competed in 17 finals, and won them all.  
Lynn, who still coaches Harris although he no longer runs for Iowa State, said at the NCAA Track and Field Championships in Baton Rouge, La., that Harris wound up at the Madrid meet almost by accident.  
He said Harris was originally planning to run at a meet in Italy on Tuesday, but that he found out that Moses was going to run in Spain, and that Harris wound up paying his own way after a ticket mix-up.  
"He ran a good workout Monday before he left Tuesday. He was prepared," added Lynn.

## Cooper-led L.A. humiliates Celts by 19 in Game 2

INGLEWOOD, Calif. — The Los Angeles Lakers, looking unstoppable again on offense, used a five-man juggernaut to tear through the Boston defense Thursday night.  
In an even more impressive offensive performance than their victory in Game 1, the Lakers took a 2-0 lead in the NBA championship series with a 141-122 decision over the Celts.

Michael Cooper, better known as a defensive specialist, showed why he is the all-time NBA playoff leader in 3-point field goals. He set a finals record with six long-range shots, two more than the previous high by Boston's Scott Wedman in 1985 against the Lakers.  
"I was just looking to take the shot in the flow of the game," Cooper said. "In the Seattle series I went something like 2-for-12, and Earvin (Magic Johnson) kept telling me to keep shooting."  
Cooper also tied a finals record with eight assists in the second quarter, but Johnson equalled the mark in the next quarter.  
"I've never seen Coop have a quarter like that before," said Lakers guard Byron Scott, who led all scorers with 24 points on 9-of-11 shooting from the field. "He's really leaped to push the ball up hard. He profited from Magic's and that's learning from the best. We don't lose much when Michael's in the game."

Cooper, who finished with nine assists, was only the fifth-leading scorer for the Lakers, who shot 61.5 percent from the field for the game, a one-game finals record.  
"When he hit the 3-pointers, all of a sudden the floor felt like it was 200 feet wide," Lakers forward Mychal Thompson said.  
"The key was Cooper really opening up their defense with 3-point shooting," Los Angeles Coach Pat Riley said. "We had to make an adjustment."  
Riley said the Celts tried to slow down the Lakers' running game by pressuring Johnson at halfcourt.  
"We had to start going over the top (of the defense) to counter that," Riley said, giving Cooper and Scott the opportunity to handle the ball more.  
Boston, which never led in the

opening, had a five-point margin in the first quarter Thursday. But the slim lead quickly evaporated under the onslaught of 75 first-half points by the Lakers, third-highest in championship series history.  
The only hope for the Celts to come back in the series is their almost-mystical record at Boston Garden, where the next three games of the series are scheduled, starting with Game 3 Sunday. They have won 84 of their last 86 games there.  
"Going home can only help," Celtics Coach R.C. Jones said. "We played poorly on the road all year and throughout the playoffs."  
The Celts, who are trying to become the first team to repeat as NBA champions since the 1968-69 season, have lost six consecutive postseason games away from Boston Garden.

Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, and James Worthy, their leading scorer for the last six playoff games with a 29.5 average, added 23 each for the Lakers, while Johnson had 22 points and 20 assists.  
Cooper, the NBA's Defensive Player of the Year, made four of the 3-pointers in the first half when Los Angeles took a 75-48 lead and shot 62 percent from the field.  
The eight assists in a quarter matched the record set by Boston's Bob Cousy in 1957, Johnson in 1984 and Houston's Robert Reed in 1986.

The Lakers' 75 points at halftime has been exceeded only by the 79 points the Celts scored against the Lakers in 1985 and the 76 points the Celts scored against St. Louis in 1990.  
The Lakers, now 3-1 in the playoffs after compiling an NBA-best 65-17 mark in the regular season, have a chance to become the second team to make it through the playoffs with only one loss. The Philadelphia 76ers won the championship in 1983 with a 12-1 record and the Lakers would need 15 victories because of an expanded playoff format.

Larry Bird led the Celts with 23 points, while Kevin McHale and Dennis Johnson added 20 each. Johnson was very hot from the outside in the third quarter, scoring 12 points as the Celts shot 64 percent from the field in the period only to see the Lakers hot 13 of 19 attempts for 64.4 percent.

## Sklavos wins his rematch vs. Clarke

SOUTH LAKE TAHOE, Nev. — Twin Falls' Carl Sklavos easily retained his world title in professional karate Wednesday night by scoring a 12-round, unanimous decision over Jerry Clarke in a rematch between the world flyweight champions.

The victory, Sklavos' 14th in as many bouts, came by an even wider margin than that was awarded when he lifted the world flyweight title from Clark on March 20 in Twin Falls.  
The fight was held at Harrah's Club in this Sierra Nevada resort town.  
The largest spread was 19-15 on one judge's card while on the other two cards the 23-year-old Sklavos was given the nod 16-14 and 20-15-1. To Clarke, a natural lightweight from Palm Harbor, Fla., who held the world flyweight championship for nearly four years, the defeat — just his eighth against 27 career wins — may have marked the final battle in that division.

According to Sklavos' trainer Gene Starr arrangements are already under way for a return of the sport to the Magic Valley.

## Dallas replaces Motta with veteran MacLeod

DALLAS (AP) — Former Phoenix Suns coach John MacLeod, who took his team to the NBA playoffs nine times, was named Thursday night to replace Dick Motta as coach of the Dallas Mavericks.

Terms of the contract between MacLeod and Mavericks owner Don Carter were not announced, although general manager Norm Sonju said it is "a similar ongoing handshake contract like the one that Motta had with Mr. Carter."

Motta stunned team officials last month when he resigned after seven seasons with the NBA's Phoenix Suns. "We were just delighted that John MacLeod was available at this time. We're very fortunate to have him join us. He is the correct person for the franchise at this time," Sonju said.

"We want to give Dick Motta credit for helping establish the framework for the growth of our franchise to a 55-victory team. But now, there is a new challenge and that is to chart new waters in the playoffs," he added.

The Mavericks have never advanced beyond the second round of

the NBA playoffs in their seven-year history. They were eliminated by the Seattle SuperSonics in the first round this year after winning a team-record 55 games and the Midwest Division title during the regular season.

Under MacLeod, the Suns went to the playoffs nine times and made it to the finals in 1976, when they lost to the Boston Celtics. MacLeod, 49, said he was "thrilled" to get the Mavericks job.

"I feel like a healthy tradition has just been started. I hope we can take this team to the brass ring someday," he said.

"I'm thrilled about joining the Mavericks. It's a great organization with a good young ball club that's going to mature and get better, and it's in a good city with great fan support. So, John MacLeod is a very fortunate man today," MacLeod said.

"The fact that Don Carter flew out last night after a long work day to spend time with me and my family and to watch my little daughter play a slow-pitch softball game indicates that they did want me," he said.

MacLeod met with Carter in Phoenix Wednesday night.

"When I spent the time with John and his family, I hit him with fielded them correctly and he asked me some questions," Carter said. "I think we interviewed each other."

MacLeod, his attorney Pat McGregor, Carter, Sonju and player-personnel director Rick Sund continued talks via telephone Thursday and reached agreement on hiring MacLeod about 6 p.m.

another team for two years. Kohl had demanded player or draft choice compensation to waive that clause.

"I still consider Nellie one of my five best friends in life. Whatever turmoil there was is over for him

and over for Herb," said the 49-year-old Harris, who coached the Houston Rockets from 1979-83.

Harris, the third head coach in the team's history, signed a three-year contract and said he hopes to finish his career in Milwaukee. Terms were not released.

"I want to stay here as long as they'll have me," Harris said. "I'm a basketball coach. It's what I do. It's what I am."

Harris will not become vice president of basketball operations, a title also held by Nelson. The Bucks have restructured their front office to give Director of Player Personnel Stu Inman more responsibility, Kohl said.

"We see an expanded role for Stu in this operation. Nellie was the kind of guy who dominated the organization and did a good job," said Kohl, whose family founded a major department and grocery store chain in Wisconsin.

Harris said he realized he would be following a popular coach who had great success in his final nine years.

## Kinney joins arts agency Governor appoints Twin Falls arts advocate to state board

**TWIN FALLS** — Mary Jane Kinney, a Twin Falls resident recently appointed by Gov. Cecil Andrus to the Idaho Commission on the Arts, wants to make sure that credit is given where credit is due.

"I'm not important," insisted the 62-year-old grandmother. "It's these programs and these artists that we want the publicity for."

Kinney is one of seven new appointees who will work with other members of the Idaho Commission on the Arts to encourage the study and presentation of performing, visual and literary arts within the state.

Board members review grant applications made by state artists or groups, then apply for matching grant monies from the National Endowment on the Arts.

"The arts commission is simply a conduit," explained Kinney. "The NEA provides the money that needs to be matched in state, but 'some way you can always match these things. But they (NEA) are really focusing on disadvantaged and rural states. And let's face it, you know we don't have the background or the advantages other states do have. This is one nice way to get really top-drawer people into this area. I'm really thrilled about it."

Kinney said the commission plans to assist state museums and galleries which are planning to participate in Idaho's centennial celebration in 1990.

The Twin Falls Public Library, for example, along with the Idaho Gallery of Art in Boise, is attempting to borrow the original 74-foot by 132-foot oil painting of "Shoshone Falls on the Snake River," by Thomas Moran.

The mural is currently owned by the Thomas Gilcrease Institute of American History and Art in Tulsa, Okla.

If borrowed, the painting would be displayed at the Herrett Museum and the Idaho Gallery of Art in Boise. "It's never been moved, so it's

just kind of a gift wish. But it's a tremendous painting. He (Moran) was a great, great painter," said Kinney.

Another project Kinney is enthusiastic about is the Union Pacific Railroad residency program.

Kinney recently returned from Boise, where she and other state coalition members were guests at a reception held for Elizabeth Braden, a soprano, and Janet Christensen, a pianist. They are the featured performers for the 1987-88 Union Pacific residency program.

"Oh, last night, it was so thrilling!" exclaimed Kinney. "These two girls that they have, they are something else. I tell you, they aren't stuffy musicians. They are the most tremendous, young, brilliant, educated musicians I've ever seen. And we're going to have them! That's Union Pacific's way of saying that the arts are important, see."

Kinney said her interest in and love of the arts was cultivated at home when she was a child.

Her mother, who came to Piller as a bride in 1911, was a singer.

"She was a tremendous musician and a great lady," said Kinney. "I'd always loved the arts. I think they're very much an important part of intelligence, you know."

After graduating as valedictorian from Twin Falls High School in 1942, Kinney attended Stanford University and transferred to Whitman College, where she graduated with a bachelor of arts degree and highest honors in English.

She taught school in Dayton, Wash., then came back to Idaho after World War II and married Jim Kinney of Twin Falls.

"I raised my children and I've just been active," said Kinney. "I worked for many years."

She was a charter member and past-president of the Twin Falls Federated Music Club, a life member of the National Federation of Music Clubs and past president of the Magic Valley Community Center.

**REPENTHAM** — A pink dog or a squealing pig or some kind of myth animal fills the entire canvas by Tarmo Watia.

In another Watia painting, two seated human figures are surrounded by light reds and bright lime greens with a deep but delicate black that pierces the eye.

**LOS ANGELES (AP)** — Film critics Gene Siskel and Roger Ebert are examining the adolescent interest in sadistic films such as "Bloodsucking Freaks," rented for "video nasties" parties.

The last 15 minutes of this weekend's edition of "Siskel and Ebert And The Movies" are devoted to the "nasties" problem, which Ebert said he discovered by talking to video store workers.

"They told me 'People talk about Hitchcock and Cary Grant, but 'Faces of Death' is our biggest renter.'"

Eventually it became clear enough that it was a trend that I started to do something about it," he said in a telephone interview from Chicago.

Besides the three-part "Faces of Death" videos, which depict dead people, the popular titles include "Lisa, She-Wolf of the SS," "Make Them Die Slowly," "Bloodsucking Freaks," and "2,000 Maniacs."

"I think a lot of parents who hear that are very easy-going. I think room may think they are looking at a horror film like they saw 20 years ago," said Ebert. "But these movies are really in a different category. One name for them is splatter films."

"And one of the things that often have in common is the mutilation and sadistic torture of women," he said.

The mutilation of animals and human beings in unending, non-story form, presented as entertainment, is a terrible, terrible confusion to place in the mind of a youngster."

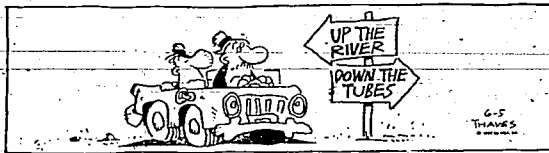

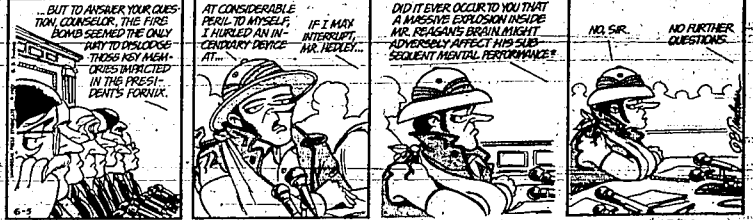

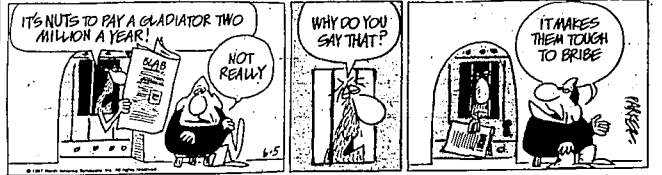

In it, we watch the mesmerizing spectacle of a bigfoot nuzzling himself so thoroughly in the sensibility of another that he disappears, like a drowning man sinking slowly beneath waves of choiceness. The filmmaker is director, co-writer, co-producer William Dear, and the ocean in which he is drowning is Steven Spielberg, whose brilliant entertainment produced "Harry," and whose "E.T." provided the definitive inspiration and form.

Dear's debut feature looks and sounds like a Spielberg movie. It has Spielbergian theme: the beneficence and courage of white suburban America in a fairy-tale nightmare-invasion. It has a Spielberg camera: Allen Daviau, who also shot "E.T." And it has a Spielberg visual style: Disney filtered through Orson Welles, David Lean and Alfred Hitchcock.

It has Spielberg optimism and a high beautiful Spielberg sheen: Every technical credit is superb. In the movie, Spielberg people drive beach toys, Spielberg people play animals, Spielberg people have big eyes, and a Spielberg sun smiles down radiantly from a Spielberg sky upon a warm and love, it occasionally deranged, Spielberg town. The very houses seem to cry: "Spiel's in his Berg; it's right with the world!"

More than directors Bob Hooper, Richard Donner or Barry Levinson, William Dear has gotten his boss' kick down pat. But he has not captured Spielberg's fairy-tale acumen, audience sense, or flair for archetypes. The lovable bigfoot, as fashioned by Rick Baker and mimed by Kevin Peter Hall, is the movie's

major triumph. He is a brutish, beagling lumberer with expressive eyes and a bewitchingly mobile face. But is a lovable, well-lit bigfoot really a good idea? Shouldn't he be less of a persecuted kid, more of an occasional Prometheus hero?

Harry is a dignified Noble Savage pursued through town by a fearful populace, hog-wild and gun-crazy; chased through the backwoods by obsessive entrepreneurs. The idea, as in "E.T.," is to contrast the intolerance of communities and the failures of rationalism and bigotry with the gut wisdom of kids and the generosity of families.

But there are only two primary, very thin, comic plays. One: How do you hide a bigfoot crumpling around your home while he decimates your refrigerator, furniture and floors? Two: Aren't suburbanites silly? Dear and his writers belabor the first and belittle the second.

Jerry Seaga is more sitcom than tagline when he is too mad to joke where the Hendersons frantically try to disguise Harry's presence, or where Harry clumps around, idly unobserved. The wondrous is often trivialized, and Seattle's mass descent into lynch hysteria has the zapped-up inevitability of a video game.

Along with the production values — and "Harry" himself — John Lithgow, as George Henderson, is the glue that holds everything together. Lithgow is an unusually sensitive actor with a genuine gift for frenzy. Sometimes, his constricted voice and pale, bulging eyes

seem ablaze with repressed hysteria. His Henderson has a shambling, tamed bravado. He is conceived as a warm, decent man driven by a macho father (M. Emmet Walsh as the local gun peddler), and Lithgow makes sense of this stereotyped role: the huntman who wants to draw the artist mantle in a Seattle Seahawk T-shirt. He juggles both sides against each other, and his reactions to Harry — wild-eyed, fury, dazed or exhilarated — are wonderful.

But Lithgow and Hall provide the movie's only major interaction. Melinda Dillon has a ditzy role, with ditty games, fustily wiping off the refrigerator after it has been topped and totaled, and the children (Margaret Langrick and Joshua Rudoy) tend toward the wide-eyed,

of the Sun Valley Center, much of Watia's art relates to composition. Watia, she says, is constantly studying the relationship of the figure to be drawn and the surface the figure sits on.

Often, while toying with this figure-ground relationship, Watia sets up mathematical problems of space and then tries to solve them by drawing through the problem. McColl says that this makes Watia's paintings much more complex than they seem at first glance. Watia calls it "mental gymnastics."

Watia also enjoys experimenting with color by putting an unusual color in a different place on the canvas — lime green on one edge — then he'll paint around it until it works with the rest of the painting.

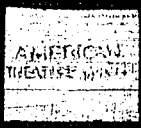

# British theater vies with Yanks in the '41st Annual Tony awards'

By EVAN LEVINE

The British are coming! The nominations at "The 41st Annual Tony Awards" attest to a full-scale British theatrical invasion. The year's most successful musicals — "Les Miserables," based on the Victor Hugo classic, and "Starlight Express," which chronicles a cross-country train race (and has the largest advance sales in history), are both imports. So are "Me and My Girl," the 1930s musical about a cockney who is actually an earl, and the Royal Shakespeare Company production of "Les Liaisons Dangereuses," a drama of sexual intrigue set in 18th Century France. The awards, hosted by Angela Lansbury, will be aired live by CBS from the Mark Hellinger Theater in New York City, on Sunday, June 7.

Despite the huge advance sales of "Starlight Express," it is dismissed by serious theatergoers as all glitz, no content. By contrast, "Les Miserables" is considered the hottest ticket in town and is the favorite to emerge as the big winner at this year's ceremonies. The lack of strong American contenders has caused some concern on Broadway, since Americans have always considered the musical our very own. This year the British imports, which trumpet style as much as substance, dominate the nominations. The only non-British musical among the nominees is the short-lived "Rags," a tale of the immigrant experience in New York.

The British musicals should have no trouble capturing awards for Best Musical, Best Original Score and Best Actor in a Musical in some combination. A close race for the latter appears to be between Colin Wilkinson, who plays Jean Valjean in "Les Miserables," and Robert Lindsay, the quixotic star of "Me and My Girl."

But when it comes to plays, Americans are on firmer ground. "Les Liaisons Dangereuses" is the sole British entry, and the strongest contender seems to be August Wilson's "Fences," starring James Earl Jones. The play has already garnered several awards, including a Pulitzer Prize. The other nominees for Best Play are "Broadway Bound," the final installment in Neil Simon's trilogy about growing up in Brooklyn, and "Coastal Distur-

bances." Tina Howe's tale of love set on a Massachusetts beach.




For Best Actor in a Play, James Earl Jones' strongest competition is Richard Kiley, who is appearing in Arthur Miller's "All My Sons." The other nominees are Phillip Bosco for "You Never Can Tell" and Alan Rickman for "Les Liaisons." Linda Lavin, the strong-willed mother of "Broadway Bound," seems a likely choice for Best Actress. She is competing against Lindsay Duncan ("Les Liaisons"), Geraldine Page ("Blithe Spirit"), and Amanda Plummer ("Pygmalion").

As usual, there are a few conspicuous absences among the nominees: They include Robert

DeNiro ("Cuba and His Teddy Bear"), Mary Tyler Moore ("Sweet Sue") and Richard Chamberlain ("Blithe Spirit").

"I wanted to see if I could act again," says Frances, who has played Alice Horton on "Days of Our Lives" for 22 years.

Under a white wig, Frances pulled it off. Fans couldn't see a trace of Alice Horton in the poor, mixed-up lady.

But the role made a deep imprint. "For weeks I couldn't remember anything," Frances admitted. "I thought I had the disease."

Not a chance. Miss Reid may have lapses with names like the rest of us, but she's quick and funny. Handling reporters, she recalls playwright Frederic Molnar's warning: "Don't say anything. Let the interviewer make it up."

Allowed to select two clips for Emmy judges, Frances chose footage of Alice Horton giving advice on premarital sex to her granddaughter, and a sequence of Alice's birthday party with her grandchildren. The latter had little to do with Alice dramatically, but Frances liked the look of everybody together.

"There was no mention of Alice's age at the party," Frances noted.

"Fans are supposed to guess. I would say Alice is in her 80s."

Signed to a 13-week "Days of Our Lives" contract along with MacDonald Carey (Tom Horton), Frances never gave a thought to a pink slip. "In my day 13 weeks was a grand Broadway run. This one has lasted 22 years."

Nominated for Daytime Emmys before, Frances is pleased to be included because her fellow actors are doing the voting. She remembers all of the Daytime Emmy squabbles, the ridiculous war between East and West Coast shows. Things are settling down now, as daytime people grow up. An Emmy would be nice to

have, but in Reid's mind, an Oscar really counts.

"In 22 years the world had changed, and so have soaps. What you see in the paper, you will soon see on the show — mobsters, surrogate mothers, whatever is in fashion," Frances continues. "Everybody looks at soaps. Even Franco Zeffirelli, the movie man, wants our Bill Warlock and Jennifer Perriman for a movie. Billy, as a young Arturo Toscanini, but contracts won't allow that."

Frances works two days a week according to her contract, which gives her time to read the whole script when working, something others seldom do. At home she's waiting for the plumber, or the pool cover man, or the carpenter. "Life is hard at home," she says. "It's a relief to be at the studio."

This June, Frances will be back in her favorite city, New York, for the Emmy Awards. And at night she will be in the balcony watching a play — her idea of heaven.

The affiliates also learned that ABC Sports reject Joe Namath has signed a multi-year contract to join Marv Albert on one of NBC's NFL announcing teams starting this fall....

Affiliates also met Maria Shriver and Boyd Matson, the anchor team for the new "Sunday Today" show, debuting in September....

Shriver was introduced as a "veteran of 'CBS Morning News'" before she jumped to NBC in time to get a spot on the canceled "1986."

## Letterman says Rivers will bounce back

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) — David Letterman says fellow talk-show host Joan Rivers might have made some mistakes going it on her own, but probably didn't do any permanent damage to her career.

Rivers left an enviable spot as permanent guest host for Johnny Carson on NBC's "The Tonight Show" for her own show on the fledgling Fox network. The move angered Carson, who took a few potshots on the air when Rivers recently parted company with Fox over low ratings for "The Late Show."

"I think one thing you can't do in show business is burn bridges behind you," Letterman said. "Show business is such an odd, quirky thing that you can be sued for several million dollars one day and then the next day the same company hires you to go to work for them."

"I think show business may be the one area where burning bridges doesn't mean anything."

Letterman, himself a frequent substitute and potential successor to Carson on "Tonight," said Rivers' saga proves the fragile nature of the late-night, talk-show business. He made the observations while in Las Vegas to tape four nights of his own "Late Night" at a Strip resort.

"It's really a difficult thing to start a new TV show from scratch," Letterman said. "I was really lucky

because NBC kept us on the air when we were struggling, and they kept us on two or three years into it when another organization might not have kept us on.

"Joan was dealing with television stations across the country which were not perhaps prime broadcasting outlets, like Channel 85 in Tipton, Ind. We had the support of an established network and we were also following a show ("Tonight") which had been a hit for 25 years, where she was on her own.

"If you're on a channel in a city that nobody watches 23 hours a day, there's no reason to believe that for one hour a day they're going to turn over and watch you."

Letterman doesn't think Rivers was wrong in quitting as Carson's top guest host.

"I don't think anybody begrudges her making a move for success on her own terms," he said. "I just think she handled it in a graceless fashion."

How?

"By suddenly turning on NBC and saying unpleasant things about Johnny and 'The Tonight Show.' I think there were going to be hard feelings regardless of how she handled it. But if it were me, I certainly would have tried to avoid things to generate ill feelings."

Though he has been happy as host of the quirky and popular "Late Night" for five years, Letterman said he would be "stupid" not to consider the "Tonight Show" job.

# John Ritter's new comedy series gives some hope to ABC ad execs

NEW YORK (AP) — ABC Entertainment President Brandon Stoddard walked on stage and noted ruefully to the assembled advertising execs that the lack of air conditioning in the muggy theater was a perfect ending for a not-so-perfect year.

"I'm really glad this year's over, I'll tell you," Stoddard offered candidly, listing some of the woes that produced the network's worst-rated season since 1954 — baseball playoffs on NBC, too much hype for the miniseries "Amerika," production woes on "Moonlighting," and uproar over the decision to move the decade-old news show "20-20" to a potential death slot on Friday nights in the fall.

Stoddard took off his coat to cope with the heat, then unveiled a lineup that shows ABC has no intention of throwing in the towel.

"We've mounted a schedule with some real risks," he told the advertisers, who will be getting pitches to buy spots in fall network shows this month.

Stoddard playfully fell on his knees before one of ABC's biggest hopes, Dolly Parton, who will have a variety show in the fall. She came out on stage to charm advertisers, promising Stoddard, "I'm gonna be tryin' a lot harder than anybody else you would've paid this much money to."

ABC's only consistently top-rated shows this season were "Who's the Boss?" "Growing Pains" and "Moonlighting." Stoddard assured the ad execs that even though "Moonlighting" star Cybill Shepherd is pregnant with twins, due in the fall, she will be on the show from the beginning of the season, returning full-time in January.

John James and Emma Samms stars of the canceled spinoff "The Colbys," will return to "Dynasty," Stoddard said.

He also noted changes in other returning shows, including a love interest "who can't change a lightbulb" for inventive adventurer "MacGyver," new jobs at a newspaper for Balki and cousin Larry on "Perfect Strangers" and less-involved "Max Headroom" plots with romantically more-involved lead characters.

Of the new series on ABC's fall schedule, the most promising — and the one that drew the most enthusiastic response from the ad execs — was "Hooperman," a half-hour comedy-drama that will go up

against "The Equalizer" on CBS and NBC's "St. Elsewhere" this fall.

It stars John Ritter as a detective who inherits a run-down apartment building and comes from Steven Bochco and Terry Louise Fisher, co-creators of "L.A. Law." Bochco also co-created "Hill Street Blues."

The pilot opens in characteristic "grabby" Bochco style, with Ritter in a spluttering shower, his hair covered in shampoo. He gets out of the shower, goes to the toilet and lifts the lid from the tank, pulls out the float and dunks his head.

"Thirtysomething" is a bit-ter-sweet, '80s comedy-drama ABC is putting behind "Moonlighting" on Tuesdays. It, too, drew applause from the advertisers — with its realistically funny portrayal of a young couple with a baby.

"If the schedule doesn't improve, catch me on 'General Hospital,'" Stoddard quipped after advertisers watched him act, quite professionally, in a clever clip promoting another sitcom, "I Married Dora," about a conservative widower who marries his Salvadoran housekeeper so she won't be deported.

Stoddard comes to visit a supposedly real household, becomes intrigued by the family's situation and declares, "This is perfect for a maybe 8:30!"

Dabney Coleman appeared in a clip to promote his new sitcom, "Slap Maxwell," in which he plays a sportscaster. This time, his character will get a dash of vulnerability — the missing ingredient in his daring

but short-lived "Buffalo Bill" series on NBC.

"Hi, ad guys," Dabney Coleman said in a brief promotional clip for his new series "Slap Maxwell," about a hard-edged sportscaster with a soft side. He said the producers would have liked to have shown some of the show, but "to be honest, we haven't shot anything yet."

Stoddard said "Sledge Hammer!" the off-beat cop who talks to his gun was the only guy willing to take on "The Cosby Show" on Thursday nights. "Sledge," Stoddard said, "has steadily built a loyal following of kids, teen-agers and disturbed young men."

It will be followed on Thursdays by "The Charmings," a sitcom about Prince Charming and Snow White in modern-day suburbia. ABC has pitted the fairy-tale characters against the "Cosby" spinoff "A Different World." "We had to," Stoddard said. "They were the only people on the network who still believe there's a happy ending."

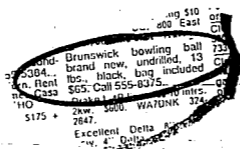

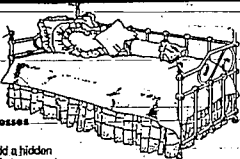
