## Gramm-Rudman impasse holds up Congress

WASHINGTON — House and Senate negotiators struggled into the night Thursday but failed to reach a compromise on legislation that would restore the threat of automatic spending cuts to the Gramm-Rudman budget-balancing law.

"We're making progress, but painful and slow," said Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, D-Texas. The impasse blocked enactment of an urgently needed increase in the national debt limit. The Treasury prepared to suspend sales of government securities Friday because an interim debt ceiling expired at midnight Thursday.

## Gulf policies under attack once again

WASHINGTON — President Reagan's Persian Gulf policy came under fire Thursday on Capitol Hill as more than 100 legislators said they would file suit to invoke the War Powers Act and limit the president's ability to send troops to situations of imminent danger.

The announcement came as a pair of Democratic-controlled committees in the House heard testimony on two Persian Gulf-related bills opposed by the Reagan administration. One would provide "danger pay" of \$110 a month for U.S. servicemen in the gulf and the other would halt the reflagging of Kuwaiti oil tankers.

Reagan and the Democratic-controlled Congress began battling in May about the administration's plan to refit 11 Kuwaiti oil tankers and protect them with Navy warships. On May 17, 37 U.S. seamen were killed by an Iraqi missile attack on the frigate Stark.

But Congress has been unable to agree on action that would block Reagan's plan, and Thursday's announced moves were the latest, and last, attempt before Congress adjourns for its August recess.

The Persian Gulf plan has been sharply criticized by legislators who fear the United States will be brought into the Iran-Iraq war because Kuwait has aided Iraq.

The War Powers Act was pushed by Rep. Mike Lowry, D-Wash., chairman of the House Democratic Caucus, who said the suit would be filed Friday in U.S. District Court in Washington by 110 members of both the House and Senate.

"This is exactly the sort of a situation the War Powers Act was designed to deal with," Lowry told a news conference.

The War Powers Act was enacted in 1973 during the waning days of the Vietnam War. It says a president can only send troops to areas of "imminent danger" for 60 days unless Congress specifically approves the deployment.

The administration has argued that the War Powers Act does not apply to the current gulf deployment of U.S. ships because the United States is officially neutral in the Iran-Iraq war.

Later Thursday, White House spokesman Roman Popadiuk declined to respond directly to the announcement that more than a hundred members of Congress planned to take the issue to court.

## Dispute stalls peace efforts

WASHINGTON — President Reagan's Central America peace initiative became bogged down in a procedural dispute Thursday as Secretary of State George P. Shultz said but ruled out a Nicaraguan call for direct talks between the two countries on the plan.

"I think it is critical to establish that there is no way the United States would want to sit down with Nicaragua to decide what is right for Central America. That has to be done by all the Central American countries," Shultz told a news conference.

Hours after the peace initiative was unveiled on Wednesday, Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega called for an "unconditional dialogue" with the United States on the plan.

Ortega's proposal was consistent with Nicaragua's longstanding position that the United States is responsible for the armed struggle in

his country and that bilateral talks are the only hope for a solution. The United States and Nicaragua held a series of peace talks in the latter half of 1984 but that process was suspended by the Reagan administration in early 1985.

Shultz left the door slightly ajar to talks with Nicaragua, saying the United States is willing to confer with all countries involved in the peace process.

But he said that option would be pursued only if it would advance the goal of a regional solution to Central America's problems. He added that the administration is hoping that progress can be made at the meeting of Central American presidents that got under way Thursday in Guatemala City.

Adolfo Calero, one of the Contra leaders who went to Guatemala City to lobby support for the Reagan plan, said Thursday that the rebels should participate in any peace negotiations.

"If we are the ones who are answering the fire of the Sandinistas, we have to participate in the negotiations," he said. "We have to see PEACE on Page A2"

## College tuition costs to keep up fast climb

NEW YORK — College tuitions will continue to climb faster than the inflation rate this fall, and total student expenses at some elite institutions will top \$18,000.

Average annual tuition and fees will climb 8 percent at private, four-year colleges and 6 percent at public institutions, the seventh straight year such costs will outpace inflation, according to the College Board's annual survey of college costs released Thursday.

At the nation's most expensive school, tiny Bennington College in Bennington, Vt., total estimated costs will reach \$18,300.

Average total estimated costs at all four-year private schools will be less than \$12,000, and at public schools will be almost \$6,800.

This fall marks the third consecutive year the 6 percent tuition and fee hike at private elite institutions. The 6 percent average

increase at public, four-year colleges equaled last year's rise, but was less than the 9 percent increase in 1985-86.

College costs thus continue to surge ahead of the overall inflation rate as measured by the Consumer Price Index which has risen at a seasonally adjusted 5.4 percent rate so far in 1987. Inflation has stood at 4 percent or less every year since 1982.

Using a new method of calculating average college costs which takes each school's enrollment into account, the board estimated that average "fixed charges" at private, four-year institutions — tuition, fees, room and board — will hit \$10,493 for 1987-88. Counting incidental expenses such as books, supplies and transportation, estimated annual costs rise to \$11,982 for students living on campus, and to \$10,173 for commuting students.

## New county budget includes pay hikes for elected officials

TWIN FALLS — The Twin Falls County Board of Commissioners has proposed a 5-percent pay hike for all county elected officials, starting Oct. 1.

They want to give themselves a 10-percent increase, however, to bring their pay up to the same level as other elected officials, Board Chairman Judy Felton said.

The salary increases, which will be the first in two years, are part of the proposed 1987-88 county budget. The new budget becomes effective Oct. 1.

Each of the three full-time county commissioners, who include Marvin Hempleman and Jim Frisley, now make \$20,160 a year. Assessor Dorothy Hamby, Clerk Dick Pence and Treasurer Bonnie Bruning each make about \$21,100 a year.

Under the proposed budget, the salaries of the clerk, treasurer and assessor will be raised to \$22,169, Felton said. The commissioners' salaries will also jump to that figure, which doesn't include benefits.

"We are bringing ourselves up to same as theirs," Felton said. "We feel the commissioner undoubtedly should be paid equal to the other elected officials."

The discrepancy between the county board members and other elected officials probably dates back to a time when the commissioners worked part-time, she said.

Prosecutor K. Ellen Baxter, who earns about \$34,500 a year, will receive about \$38,200 a year under the proposed budget. Sheriff Jim Munn's salary will go from about \$22,000 a year to about \$23,100 a year. And Coroner Cal Edwards, who works part-time now for about \$3,790 a year, will move up to about \$3,900 a year.

The prosecutor and sheriff earn

more than other elected officials because of the special training and experience required for their jobs, Felton said.

Felton expects some public criticism over the proposed pay increase for the commissioners, who were given the authority by the Legislature to set their wages and those of other elected officials.

She has already heard public criticism over the proposed pay hike for Pence, who has been criticized for how he is performing his duties. But Felton said the public evaluates the public official. The public decided they want Dick back in office and until the public decides they don't want him, he will be treated equally as the other elected officials. See COUNTY on Page A2

Responding to Ortega's call for U.S.-Nicaragua negotiations, Calero said, "No part of the proposal calls for bilateral talks, only regional talks."

Assistant Secretary of State Elliott Abrams was more blunt than Shultz in a televised interview. Wednesday night when he was asked about the Nicaragua call for bilateral talks.

"What they'd like to do apparently is to delay more and try to

make it out as if this were a U.S.-Nicaragua struggle," Abrams told ABC-TV. "It isn't. It's a war among Nicaraguans."

"I think their purpose is probably to delay as much as possible but not be blamed for turning down the president's plan," he said.

The strongest criticism of Reagan's initiative has come not from the Sandinista government but from members of Congress who are either strongly opposed to the Nicaragua Contras or strongly in favor.

lected officials. I don't think they (the public) want us to pass judgment on other elected officials. That is their privilege to do that," she said.

Fifth District Court judges recently took over jury-selection duties, formerly supervised by Pence, after they found inadequate selection procedures for a grand jury.

At fall, the Secretary of State's Office asked Pence not to allow his deputies to open absentee ballots before election day. Baxter investigated the incident and declined prosecution of Pence after finding no criminal intent.

The Secretary of State's Office announced recently that it would sponsor training sessions for Pence and

his deputies on election procedures. Pence has been in office since 1978. He was re-elected in November.

Raising the salaries of the county employees was a priority in the 1987-88 budget, Felton said.

"They have been faithful and committed to their jobs. Most other public agencies have been more generous than we have," she said.

Heads of county departments, who in most cases are elected officials, will pass on wage hikes based on job evaluations, Felton said. As a result, some might receive less than a 5 percent increase. Other employees might receive more if their job duties have expanded or they are doing their jobs extremely well, she said.

The commissioners asked the

lected officials to use 5 percent as a guideline" for employee wage hikes, she said.

A majority of the county employees have also gone without a wage increase for more than two years. Budgets for salaries, in fact, have been frozen for two years, Felton said. A department supervisor, however, might have awarded wage hikes to employees if they had extra funds in their budget.

"I think the public will understand that the people working for county government need pay increases occasionally, just like anyone else does," Felton said. "We don't think our salaries are exorbitant at all."

The public will have the opportunity to comment on the budget at hearings scheduled in September.

By midafternoon Thursday, skies in Idaho remained sunny with only some scattered clouds reported in the central mountains and the panhandle.

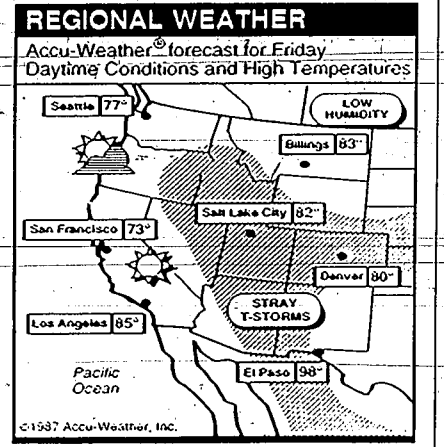
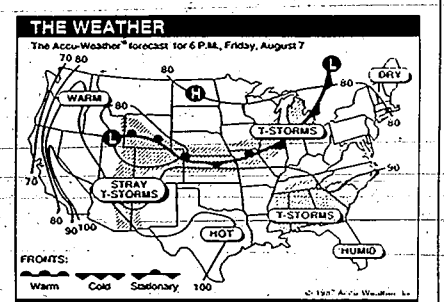
Temperatures warmed to the low 80s throughout Idaho with the exception of some northern locations, which had readings still in the 70s.

# Emergency allocation for prison OK'd

BOISE (AP) — The state Permanent Building Fund Advisory Council has approved an emergency allocation of up to \$22,000 for the remodeling of the Death Row and the close-custody tiers of the maximum-security unit at the main state prison south of Boise.

The five-member council unanimously approved the emergency allocation on Thursday after Corrections Director Al Murphy and Public Workers Director Anne Barker briefed it on the damage from last weekend's disturbance in which five condemned killers broke out the walls between six cells on one side of Death Row and three on the other.

"It's a life-threatening situation," Ms. Barker said. "We need to harden the cells."

The money, saved when three roofing projects at the prison were completed below original cost estimates earlier this year, will underwrite interior remodeling to beef up security, including steel reinforcement of the walls between the 28 cells on each tier and replacement of porcelain plumbing fixtures with steel ones and metal bed frames with concrete platforms. Murphy said the work would take about 3½ months.

Similar modifications were made to the administrative-segregation tier in the unit after disruptions there over the past two years.

The disruption on Death Row last weekend was sparked by a distur-

bance in the administrative-segregation tier, but Murphy said there was no damage in that wing.

"Sloves of a few scratches and peeling of paint, you couldn't tell it took a pounding, and it has taken a pounding in the last few days," Murphy told the council.

Repair of the two tiers has taken on great importance because of the continuing scrutiny the entire prison system has been under from a federal judge who has ordered improvements in overall conditions at the main facility.

"Considering the logistics of complying with the federal court order to relieve overcrowding ... in the next few months," Murphy said, "it is clear that an emergency exists and that the repair of the damage cells must be accomplished as quickly as possible."

Labeling all the death row inmates the most dangerous in the prison, Murphy said, "Any such action by these inmates is considered to be life threatening to the other inmates and the officers who are required to investigate and respond to the disturbance."

Murphy said the reason for the disruption late Saturday and early Sunday was still under investigation, but it appeared that the Death Row inmates "just wanted to let us know they were on the tier. They wanted to firmly establish that Death Row inmates are going to run that tier."

# Ethanol marketer sees future in energy policy

POCATELLO (AP) — The head of a major ethanol fuel marketer in Idaho is optimistic about the future for the alcohol-gasoline blend that could help reduce grain stockpiles, but Jim Glancey concedes major gains for the fuel will be prompted only by its inclusion in a national energy policy.

Glancey, chairman of Ethanol Marketing Inc., said the 10-percent-alcohol-90-percent-gasoline mixture has been making steady gains in the Boise and Burley markets and "marketing is picking up in the Pocatello area."

But while fuel-alcohol production offers struggling Idaho grain growers an outlet for their surplus production, ethanol still accounts for just 4 percent of all fuel sales in the state, and Glancey said it takes some extra demand to exceed supplies in Idaho for a combination of reasons.

And it will take development of a national energy policy that places some emphasis on the use of ethanol, Glancey said, to change the situation and mandate a place for alcohol fuels in reducing America's energy dependence, cut air pollution and stretch domestic oil reserves. Prospects for that, however, appear good, he said.

"Quite frankly, the outlook is

very, very positive," Glancey said after returning from an alcohol fuel conference in the Midwest. "It will be a major platform item for all the candidates in the upcoming election in 1988."

Sluggish expansion of the ethanol market, he said, has been due in large part to reluctance of investors to back new distillation plants, the slump in oil prices that has made ethanol less competitive with gasoline and the refusal of some oil companies to allow their stations to sell the blended fuel.

The oil companies, Glancey contended, "want to control their destiny from well head to the retail pump. I can't find fault with that thinking, but I do find fault if it's put into effect in agricultural states to the detriment of farmers."

He said farmers have to realize that ethanol use is tied directly to the price of oil and not the grain used to make the alcohol so that when oil prices are depressed grain prices, the oil glut has undermined fuel-alcohol markets.

"We've gone through all the ups and downs, the growth problem, the pricing problems of the industry," Glancey said. "Whether you like it or not, we're tied directly to the gasoline business."

# County takes state inmates

WALLACE (AP) — The Shoshone County Jail has taken on 15 prisoners from the Idaho Department of Corrections facility at Orofino following a disturbance at the state prison in Boise over the weekend, Shoshone County Sheriff Frank Ornkovich said.

However, negotiations for using the Public Safety Facility in Wallace as a satellite prison have been hindered by a strike last September by Corrections Department spokesman Tim McNeese said the Wallace jail is the only one in Idaho being

used to house state prisoners.

Nine inmates demolished walls Saturday night, causing \$70,000 in damage until the violence was quelled. The prisoners were moved to other cells within the facility and a renovation of the cells to prevent such damage again is anticipated.

Capacity of the Wallace facility is set at 64, but Ornkovich said that maximum is almost impossible to meet since prisoners must be segregated as male and female, convicted and non-convicted and several types of security.

# No charges for camping with children

NAMPA (AP) — Nampa police say no charges will be filed in Canyon County against a 30-year-old man who sparked a search when he took three children camping in Valley County.

Nampa police said their investigation showed no evidence that John Leach committed a crime when he took the three children of Angelita Vela — Claudia Mata, 12; Enequina Mata, 9; and Clemente Mata, 6, all

of Nampa.

The Health and Welfare Department reached the same conclusion, police said.

However, the files will be turned over to authorities in Valley County, where Leach and the children were found July 23 camping near Yellow Pine.

Leach is awaiting a parole revocation hearing this month.

# Critical fire line reinforced

WARM LAKE (AP) — Firefighters on Thursday reinforced a critical break line between the Ragged Dollar Creek Fire and the valuable salmon and steelhead fishery on the South Fork of the Salmon River in west central Idaho as winds kept trying to push the flames back toward the river.

"With the wind it wants to go back to the east, to the river, but it will burn uphill as long as it can and that's to the northwest," said Boise National Forest spokesman Greg Spangenberg.

"We're into it for a couple more days at least," said Spangenberg, quoting fire bosses who indicated the fire would not be contained before Saturday.

"Some 250 firefighters remained committed to the lightning-sparked blaze that has already covered some 440 acres of brush and ponderosa pine just north of Warm Lake. Fire bosses continued calling in tanker strikes of chemical retardant in an attempt to slow the burn.

No structures have been threatened and no injuries reported. Danger to the river banks was minimal Thursday, but Spangenberg said the denuded slopes could send tons of sediment into the spawning

beds of migratory anadromous fish in the river.

North of Idaho City, mop-up continued on the 40-acre, man-caused Bad Bear Fire, and officials said they would begin releasing the 140 firefighters that had been on that blaze. # Swisher faults power planning board

BOISE (AP) — The Northwest Power Planning Council has made some enormous mistakes, and the act that created the council is not working as intended, Idaho Public Utilities Commission President Perry Swisher said.

"I call it the Rose Garden," he told a state legislative utilities committee hearing Wednesday.

The council put its staff over there in Portland alongside the BPA (Bonneville Power Administration), alongside the biggest utility in the Northwest, PacifiCorp, and they're all very happy running their little computers together and doing their planning and playing golf and holding

meetings, it's not working."

He said the Northwest Power Planning Act of 1980, drafted by much of the Northwest congressional delegation, was intended to stabilize electric power rates in the region. "We were supposed to get it," he said. "We haven't gotten it."

Robert Saxvik and Jim Goller, Idaho's members on the planning council, declined comment. The council consists of members from Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana, and develops power and conservation policy for the Northwest.

Swisher said the public, news media and politicians are not paying attention to regional power plan-

ning except for its fisheries policies. The commissioner said the planning council should have made policy and generated evidentiary information in relation to BPA rate cases and they failed to do that.

He said the council also did not consider the impact of other sources of energy when it prepared its electric power predictions.

"You can't tell what's going to happen with electricity unless you look at natural gas. There are more thermos of natural gas burned in the Northwest than there are BTUs of electricity used, and yet they left that out of the planning profile," he said.

As a result, the BPA, which sells

electric power around the Northwest, "got caught in midair" when demand for electric power diminished after oil and natural gas prices fell, he said.



# Stark saved by heroism, luck after missile struck vessel

MAYPORT NAVAL STATION, Fla. (AP) — Heroism and luck saved the USS Stark from an even worse disaster when two Iraqi missiles tore through the ship in the Persian Gulf last May, crewmen said Thursday.

Third Class Petty Officer Mark Samples of Charleston, W.Va., spent 13 hours in a darkened magazine room desperately spraying water on 36 missiles as a 2,000-degree fire raged only a bulkhead away.

Samples saved the Stark from an explosion that would have torn off the damaged frigate's bow, an officer said, and received a heroism award.

"It was pretty terrifying," said Samples. "You didn't really think a lot, but I kept wondering about all my friends."

Reporters toured the ship Thursday, one day after its return to its home port, seeing the damage done by the two Exocet missiles that killed 37 men on May 17.

No one was prepared for the missile strikes, but reactions were quick, the sailors said.

"I just heard a loud boom," said Sr. Chief Petty Officer Calvin Ellis, of Hixon, Tenn. "I knew exactly what it was because I'd been in Vietnam."

Donning a gas mask against the smoke

and heat, Ellis worked his way out of his quarters, where several sailors had been killed. Only a week before the men had gone through a drill in which they practiced leaving their berths blindfolded.

The ship was an inferno, and sailors had to avoid debris, live electrical wires and broken water pipes as they made their way to safety. The two missiles cut the ship's bow off from the stern, and had destroyed all the firefighting equipment in the bow. The sailors had to lay lines from the stern to battle the flames, which took two days to extinguish.

Even so, the missile strikes would have

been far worse had they hit just a few yards farther fore or aft, hitting the ship's missile magazine or the torpedoes, said Lt. Carl Barbour of Durham, N.C.

The first missile, which did not explode, started an intense fire which killed several petty officers trapped in their sleeping quarters.

Most of the men were killed when the second Exocet exploded in an enlisted men's sleeping area about 15 seconds later. Some died because they could not find their way out in the dark and fell into the ocean through the missile entrance hatches.

Some crewmen barely made it out of a

lounge next to the berthing area in the few seconds between the two missile strikes.

"When the second missile hit, a lot of people were on the way out," said Boatstain's Mate 3rd Class Jeff Pearson, of Palm Beach.

By Thursday's press tour the areas destroyed by the missiles were cleaned of debris, but the blackened walls were still visible and wires hung down in some spots. Although damaged bulkheads had been replaced, some holes between computer center and the repair's quarters had only minimum patches.

## Bakker woes bring prayers at conference

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — The sex and money scandal that snared Jim Bakker cost a goodly number of national meeting of his fellow believers on Thursday, resonating in their prayers of contrition and rededication even in his absence.

Delegates to the national general council of the Assemblies of God said the case was a keen concern for the 2.1 million-member denomination as it began its six-day meeting.

Bakker, founder of the PTL ministry, admitted last March a sexual liaison with a church secretary. The Assemblies of God later revoked his ministerial credentials both for adultery and alleged homosexual activity.

"It's unfortunate, but it's also a warning to others that if they let their guard down, they become vulnerable," added the Rev. Dane Van Winkle of Orlando, Fla.

Bakker's fall "makes people suspicious of the church and the straight-shooters in it that are on the level," said the Rev. Paul Baldwin of Kansas City, calling this unjustified.

"There have been both good and bad effects," he said, adding that it has focused attention on dangers of riches and lust. "There's been an awakening in the church in that sense."

The Rev. Kenneth J. Ross of Havro, Mont., said Bakker's defrocking "doesn't mean we've rejected him as a brother. There's been a lot of reaching out to help him. He's in our prayers."

The praying went on for four hours in a special room for it at the Myriad Convention Center before the convention opened in mid-afternoon with a round of formalities, greetings and departmental reports.

## Woman leaps to her death from window

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) — A woman panicked by heavy smoke ignored the pleas of her children and jumped six floors to her death from a burning hotel Thursday, authorities said.

Another guest was critically injured when he jumped from a fifth-floor window. At least 21 other people were treated for minor injuries from the early-morning fire at the Carlton Hotel, authorities said.

Louise Fryne, 57, jumped from her sixth-floor window shortly after police received the report of the fire at 2:35 a.m., Coleman said.

Her three (teen-age) children were urging her not to jump," he said. "They stayed and were subsequently rescued."

Fire officials cited the hotel's owner, Berger Hotel Corp., for failing to have a fire door to the basement of the seven-story hotel and for debris in the basement.

Fire Director Claude Coleman said the fire started in the basement in a plastic garbage bin.

## New York mayor goes to hospital

NEW YORK (AP) — Mayor Edward I. Koch was hospitalized Thursday after an attack of nausea, dizziness and slurred speech caused by a neurological disorder, doctors said.

Koch was listed in good condition at Lenox Hill Hospital, where tests indicated he had suffered from a transient-ischemic-attack, officials said.

A cerebral blood vessel spasm briefly diminished the flow of oxygen to the brain, causing discomfort but no lasting damage, doctors said.

Koch was "alert, awake, joking ... feeling quite good" and his speech was no longer slurred, said Dr. Anthony Mustalish, the hospital's chief of emergency services.

There was no indication of cerebral bleeding, and an electrocardiogram showed Koch's heart was normal, Mustalish said.

Koch would be kept at the hospital overnight, the physician said.

The 62-year-old mayor became ill about 10:30 a.m., shortly after leaving a panel discussion on AIDS at a midtown hotel.

# Private sessions wind up most of Iran-Contra probe

WASHINGTON (AP) — The congressional Iran-Contra committees quickly wrapped up their formal hearings in private on Thursday, three days after the last public hearing faded from television screens.

But a committee leader said such work remains in dealing with unanswered questions.

The committees questioned Clair George, the Central Intelligence Agency's chief of covert operations, during three days of private testimony from CIA officials.

Since Defense Secretary Caspar Weinberger completed his testimony on Monday, and committee leaders summed up the hearings in closing statements, the panels have been behind closed doors interviewing George, CIA Central American Task Force chief Alan Piers and agency counterterrorism head Duane Clarridge.

Transcripts of those sessions are to be made public next week, after classified information is expurgated from the texts by the White House.

House committee chairman Lee Hamilton, D-Ind., said the testimony from the CIA officials had not clarified the role of former agency Director William Casey in the affair. Lt. Col. Oliver North portrayed Casey as instrumental in the Iran arms deals and the Contra teapenny effort, but Casey himself

denied any detailed knowledge before he died May 6.

"We have now clarified Mr. Casey's role to the extent we'd like to," Hamilton said at a breakfast meeting with reporters.

Hamilton said that if he had been asked last November or December, "I would have answered that it probably was not a central role. Today, my sense is that it very much was a central role."

Meanwhile, ABC News said an ABC News-Washington Post poll conducted Sunday through Wednesday of this week found that a majority of Americans still don't believe President Reagan has generally told the truth about the Iran-Contra affair, though more now believe him than in recent weeks.

According to the poll, 52 percent think Reagan has told the truth compared with 44 percent who don't. The doubters were down from 60 percent on July 21 and 69 percent as recently as June 1.

Most believable among the recent major witnesses was North, with 71 percent believing he told the truth compared with 24 percent who think he lied.

Least believable was North's boss, former National Security Adviser John Poindexter, who generally supported North's version of events. Just 41 percent believed

Poindexter, while 47 percent didn't. Figures for other witnesses, with the believers outnumbering doubters in every case, were Secretary of State George Shultz, 61 percent to 26 percent; Weinberger, 63 percent to 27 percent; former White House Chief of Staff Donald Regan, 46 percent to 36 percent, and Attorney General Edwin Meese III, 44 percent to 37 percent. Remaining respondents didn't know or had no opinion in each case.

The poll also seemed to indicate that a surge in support for Contra aid linked to North's appearance at the hearings has been reversed. In a June 1 survey, Americans opposed U.S. aid to the rebels by 67 percent to 29 percent, but in the July 15 questioning, after North testified, the opposition was down to 46 percent to 49 percent. In the new poll, opposition is 69 percent to 36 percent for those favoring.

The poll's sponsors said they interviewed 1,205 adults by telephone to obtain results with a potential sampling error of plus or minus 3.5 percentage points.

All told, the hearings included 44 days of testimony from 32 witnesses.

There were no plans to call further witnesses before the full House and Senate committees.

# House panel approves interest disclosure

WASHINGTON (AP) — Legislation to require the credit-card industry to give full and timely interest rate information to consumers was approved Thursday by the House Banking, Finance and Urban Affairs Committee.

The measure was approved by voice vote. The committee rejected a proposal by Rep. Frank Annunzio, D-Ill., to put a cap on credit-card interest rates by linking them to what the federal government pays to borrow money. Currently, that would have put the ceiling at 13.8 percent.

Annunzio said he would offer his interest-cap amendment again when the bill is taken up by the full House. He told the committee that financial institutions are charging more than 18 percent while they are paying only about 6.8 percent or 5.9 percent to obtain funds.

"Any financial institution that can borrow money at 6.8 percent and relend it at 18.3 percent and claim that it is losing money on the transaction belongs in another business," he said.

However, Rep. Charles E. Schumer, D-N.Y., co-author of the bill, said the interest cap is unnecessary because the bill will "put an end to this 'keep-the-consumer-in-the-dark' marketing strategy."

# Ruder wins approval as SEC chairman

WASHINGTON (AP) — David S. Ruder, a Northwestern University business law professor, was approved by the Senate to be chairman of the Securities and Exchange Commission on Thursday despite opposition by some members of the banking committee.

The opposition to Ruder, 68, to replace John Shad, now ambassador to the Netherlands, came from senators who dislike Ruder's stands on insider trading and corporate

takeovers.

Many on Wall Street and on Capitol Hill had expected the administration to nominate someone with a background in securities law enforcement, such as U.S. Attorney Rudolph Giuliani, who has prosecuted insider traders including Dennis Levine and Ivan Boesky.

When Ruder was nominated, some congressional critics said the administration was more concerned in getting someone who shares Pre-

sident Reagan's free-market philosophy than someone who would enforce securities laws closely.

The 81-17 vote on the nomination came after Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis., chairman of the Committee on Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs, said Ruder "has no record of any concern about securities abuse." He has criticized the SEC for being too zealous in their enforcement.

# After surgery, Ecuadoran girl hopes to dance



Maria Andy makes friends with dog in Boston park

BOSTON (AP) — Maria Andy, a crippled Ecuadoran girl rescued as she was about to be thrown into a jungle bonfire because of her birth deformities, on Thursday underwent surgery she hopes will allow her to walk, "wear red shoes and dance."

Maria was rescued shortly after her birth seven years ago by two Roman Catholic nuns who brought her to an orphanage in Quito, Ecuador, where she became the best student in her class and was chosen the 1987 poster child by Por Cristo (For Christ), a non-profit medical group.

Por Cristo paid for Maria to travel to Children's Hospital in Boston, where her twisted and useless legs were amputated at the

knee Thursday. She will be fitted with artificial limbs that doctors hope will help her walk for the first time.

"She says she wants nice legs so she can wear red shoes and dance," Rosa Mino, Maria's guardian, said before the surgery. "She's not nervous. I've been telling her all this time she'll have beautiful legs. She's excited about her new legs."

Chris D'Entremont, a spokesman for Por Cristo, said the amputation was deemed necessary after Por Cristo workers found Maria's legs too twisted. Her leg muscles are almost non-existent.

The nuns in the orphanage didn't have enough medical knowledge to let her do exercise," Ms. D'Entremont said.

Since her arrival in Boston on May 29, Maria has received physical therapy to exercise the muscles in her back and legs, which are twisted from severe scoliosis — curvature of the spine.

The physical therapy Maria has received at the Braintree Hospital and the Braintree Rehabilitation Center has strengthened her thigh muscles enough so that doctors think the child will be able to walk with artificial legs. She will stay in the hospital for 10 to 15 days after the operation.

Dr. Martin Dunn, one of the founders of Por Cristo, said Maria is "a real extrovert, always with a beautiful smile and very intelligent, tops in her class in the first grade back in Ecuador."

## Opossums win welcome mat

SANTA ANA, Calif. (AP) — Orange County officials have rolled out the opossum welcome mat.

Supervisors announced Tuesday they are abandoning a 2-year-old policy of having animal control officers pick up and destroy the friendly, smug-looking marsupials and even will try to find homes for some of them.

"This is precisely what we asked for all along," said Anita Honness, a veterinarian who led the fight to save the opossums.

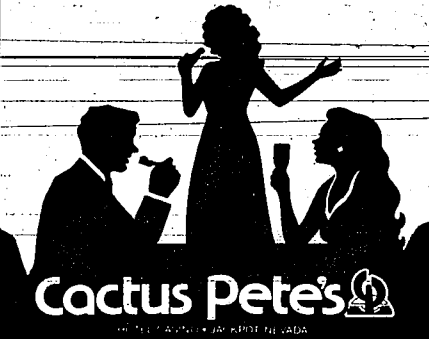

# Ortega scoffs at Reagan's proposal

GUATEMALA CITY (AP) — President Daniel Ortega of Nicaragua said Thursday the new Reagan peace proposal will be only "a publicity stunt" if the United States refuses to negotiate directly with his government.

In Washington, Secretary of State George P. Shultz responded coolly to Ortega's proposal, first made Wednesday, for direct talks on President Reagan's initiative.

Ortega often has called for direct negotiations between his leftist Sandinista government and the United States, which backs Contra rebels fighting to overthrow the Sandinistas.

After arriving here for a meeting of five Central American presidents, he told a news conference: "We have accepted an

invitation to talk, to seek peace through negotiations with the United States. If the United States rejects direct talks with us, the whole thing is a sham, a publicity stunt designed to impress whoever they think is gullible enough."

Shultz said: "I think it is critical to establish that there is no way the United States would want to sit down with Nicaragua to decide what is right for Central America. That has to be done by all the Central American countries."

The secretary of state did not reject Ortega's proposal outright, saying Washington is willing to talk to all countries involved in a solution to Central America's conflicts. He added, however, that the United States would accept direct negotiations only if they contributed to a regional solution.

Under the Reagan proposal, if Nicaragua did not introduce democratic reforms by Sept. 30 he would ask Congress for \$150 million in new aid for the Contras over the remaining 17 months of his term. The current U.S. allocation of \$100 million is to run out Sept. 30.

Ortega said the Central American summit Thursday and Friday should center on a regional peace plan proposed Feb. 16 by President Oscar Arias of Costa Rica. That plan also addresses the situation in El Salvador, where "leftists" have been fighting to overthrow the U.S.-backed government for eight years.

Asked about demands in both the Reagan and Arias proposals that Nicaragua move toward democracy, he replied:

"Nicaragua, since the revolution, has been well into democracy. We do not think these internal affairs should be a matter for an international agreement. Otherwise we would have to offer our own ideas about how to make the United States more democratic."

He described the Reagan plan as generally positive, but said it was too early to determine whether the president was sincere or merely seeking public and congressional support for more aid for the Contras.

The organization that began the search for regional peace more than five years ago may have a summit later this year, the Mexican Foreign Ministry said in a statement issued Thursday.

# Thousands fill streets, defy Panama's leader

PANAMA CITY, Panama (AP) — Tens of thousands of Panamanians filled the streets of the financial district Thursday, waving white flags in defiance of Gen. Manuel Antonio Noriega, Panama's military strongman.

Observers said it appeared to be the largest protest since the opposition campaign against Noriega began two months ago. White flags echo the waving of white handkerchiefs, a traditional form of protest in Panama. The National Civic Crusade alliance has adopted the tactic in its campaign to oust Noriega, the military commander who is the real power behind the civilian government.

Protesters in the wide Via Espana, many of them dressed in white, shouted "Peace! Justice!" People inside the high-rise

bank buildings, apartment houses and hotels hung confetti and white paper streamers from windows and terraces.

Jose Luis Fernandez, a 33-year-old dentist, said: "We're here because we want Noriega out."

The Civic Crusade, a coalition of 107 business, union, political and other groups formed in June, called the rally the "Second White Demonstration for Democracy."

Disturbances, riots and strikes began early in June when retired Col. Roberto Diaz Herrera accused Noriega of corruption, election fraud and conspiracy to murder political opponents.

Five business leaders, all members of the Civic Crusade, were in hiding Thursday because of arrest warrants.

# Iran extends exercises in stepping up tension

DUBAI, United Arab Emirates — Iran stepped up its psychological war against the United States on Thursday, extending naval maneuvers in the Persian Gulf for an additional day as a convoy of American ships made preparations to steam into the gulf.

Word of the one-day extension of the maneuvers, which started on Tuesday under the code-name "Martyrdom," was broadcast by Tehran Radio.

In the first detailed Iranian account of the exercises, the broadcast said Revolutionary Guard units were rehearsing attacks on shipping, using vessels equipped with cannon "as well as remote-controlled vessels packed with explosives and pilotless planes."

The broadcast appeared to be a thinly veiled warning to the United States, which Iran has threatened to retaliate against because of the last week's violence in Mecca. Iran

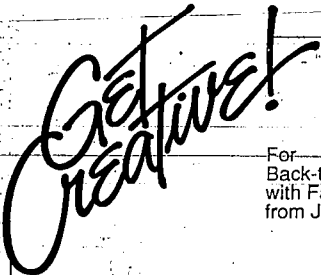
has accused Saudi Arabian authorities of massacring Iranian pilgrims in Mecca at the behest of the United States.

Iran has warned foreign shipping and warships to stay clear of Iranian territorial waters for the duration of the naval exercises.

A task force of U.S. warships has gathered off Khawr Fakkan, a port on the Gulf of Oman just outside the Strait of Hormuz, to begin the second convoy of reflagged Kuwaiti shipping.

Three Kuwaiti vessels have painted new American names on their hulls — the Gas King, the Ocean City and the Sea Isle City — signifying that they have been reregistered in the United States. After the ships hoist the American flag, they will set out with a U.S. Navy escort for the gulf.

A London newspaper, the Independent, reported Thursday that Iran is quietly appealing to Kuwait to suspend the reflagging of its tanker fleet.

# Symms slates tour of North's Contra slides

**TWIN FALLS** — Oliver North's slides are currently getting as much if not more attention than Oliver North in an effort to keep Contra momentum alive.

Idaho Sen. Steve Symms is sponsoring a traveling slide show employing some of North's slides on the Nicaraguan Contras to educate Idaho residents on America's foreign policy, a Symms aide said.

Sam Rounton, administrative assistant to Sen. Steve Symms, R-Idaho, will be in

Twin Falls Aug. 13 to speak on the "Cubanization of Nicaragua — A Threat to U.S. Interests." Rounton's noon talk to the Optimist Club in Twin Falls is one of several scheduled tours throughout the state.

His presentation will include some slides North used in his testimony before Congress investigating the Iran-Contra affair, said Tom Lowery, Symms' press secretary, on Thursday.

The show comes at a time when the Reagan administration is considering a peace proposal calling for a cease-fire and democratic reforms. If the Nicaraguan government agreed to the proposal, President Reagan has said he would hold off on seeking further military aid for the Contras.

On Wednesday, former state Rep. Robert Forrey of Nampa said he was traveling to Washington, D.C., Thursday to attend a five-day conference on the Contra problem.

Forrey also said he was returning with a set of slides, including some of North's. Twin Falls County Republican Chairman Mark Stubbs said Rounton's presentation was an effort to inform area voters about the Contra effort and point out Democratic Congressman Richard Stallings' voting record.

Philosophically, if people really knew Stallings' voting record on the Contras, they would not support him, Stubbs said. Stallings said Thursday that he has not changed his position on the Contras and likely will not vote for renewed funding if the peace initiative fails.

"I haven't really seen a change in attitude of my constituents," Stallings said. "We had a burst of energy right around the time North testified, but letters are back down and it's back to about 2-to-1 against more support."

Stallings said he was concerned that Symms was sending out aides to stir up support at a time when the president was trying to work out a peace plan.

"If part of the president's plan is to send people like Symms out to stir things up, that adds a new dimension to it," Stallings said. "But if Symms is doing it on his own, that's different."

Lowery said Rounton's presentation included no mention of Stallings' voting record and was purely an educational presentation.

Rounton, a major in the Marine Corps Reserve and a commissioned 2nd lieutenant in the Marine Corps, served as a rifle-platoon commander and a rifle company executive officer in Southeast Asia.

He was a member of the U.S. delegations to observe the Salvadoran and Guatemalan presidential elections. He was also an observer at the November 1984 Nicaraguan election.

Rounton has made nine individual tours Central America, at least one of which was paid for by Casa USA, a part of the Unification Church of the Rev. Sun Myung Moon.

## Fire alerts posted for Sawtooths, South Hills

**TWIN FALLS** — There is extreme fire danger in the northwestern sections of the Sawtooth National Forest and very high fire danger in the South Hills, says the Sawtooth National Forest.

Extreme fire danger is the highest level of concern, according to the Sawtooth system of classification.

The areas involved extend beyond the Fairfield-Ketchum Ranger District and the Sawtooth National Recreation Area, says Ed Waldpfiel, Sawtooth spokesman.

Waldpfiel says the South Hills have a lower fire classification but the danger is still serious.

The conditions are the result of a lack of rainfall, wind, high temperature and low humidity, Waldpfiel says. On Wednesday the humidity on the South Fork of the Boise River was only 10 percent.

The situation is dangerous despite higher rainfall totals last month compared to the same period a year earlier. The Ketchum Ranger District said 2.94 inches fell this July compared to 2.05 inches in July, 1986.

"Things are so dry the moisture is not soaking into the dead vegetation and the large fuels," says Waldpfiel. The forest service knows this because it takes daily measurements of the moisture in the forest.

A couple of fires were reported in the Ketchum Ranger District on Thursday.

The Sawtooth is urging the public to take the following precautions to prevent forest fires:

- Stay in the area after firewood cutting to check for any smoke from chainsaw operation.
- Smokers should clear an area.

**TWIN FALLS** — Screaming sirens and flashing lights at City Park on Thursday signaled a test of Twin Falls' emergency response.

City firefighters rescued 25 boys from a simulated explosion and walked through the motions of extinguishing a fire at the Old Reformed Church at 211 Fourth Ave. W.

Emergency Medical Technicians from Magic Valley Regional Medical Center's ambulance service then set up a treatment area under shady trees at City Park for the eager victims from area scouting packs and troops.

Some of the "lucky" 10- and 11-year-olds got ambulance rides to MVRMC, while others were heaved over firefighters' shoulders and carried to Twin Falls Clinic and Hospital.

Webeles leader Valerie Langford confided, "A lot of them were excited about it from last year and were really, really good."

The annual drill taps the knees of emergency personnel to test their reactions to emergency situations.

Ambulance, fire, police and sheriff's personnel brush up on cooperative efforts to deal with a large-scale emergency.

"I think the drills are nice to have a better chance to go through the procedures," said TFC nurse Jenny Smith, who coordinated the disaster.

"You really need to go through the motions," added Fred Webb, fire battalion chief.

Dozens of onlookers wandered toward the lunchtime commotion as victims with grizzly imitations of compound fractures and facial burns were carried from the church.

But, associates in interest—flagged after about 15 minutes as observers detected a lack of true death and

gore. Later, official critiques gave mixed review—short supply of emergency personnel marred an otherwise successful operation.

"It was good and bad," said Advanced Emergency Medical Technician Tom Teater, who critiqued the ambulance response from Magic Valley Regional Medical Center.

He praised the "ingenuity" of firefighters, who carried at least seven errant patients across City Park to Twin Falls Clinic and Hospital because ambulances were responding to real emergencies at the time.

"You guys made it successful this time,"—Advanced EMT Chris Roberts told Webb while reviewing the drill.

The lack of ambulances, with only one on site for the first half-hour, meant an inordinate number of serious patients were sent to TFC, Teater said. Under better circumstances the serious cases would be split between TFC and MVRMC, he said.

The shortage also limited how much treatment EMTs could provide. EMTs had to leave equipment in the vehicle, Teater said, in case another real emergency erupted.

Quick Response Units from Filer and Hanson were called to fill in for local ambulances. But Filer-QRU had to respond to another real emergency and missed most of the action.

Hansen QRU never responded to the drill call, Teater said.

Shortage of ambulances, which delayed transporting patients, could occur during real emergencies, officials said. But Jerome and Cassia counties could be called in for assistance in those cases.

## State nod expected on Filer library

**BUIH** — Plans for the new Filer library are back on the fast track.

The state Department of Public Works has given its commitment to the library, said city engineer Scott Bybee Tuesday.

Bybee told the Filer City Council that last week he received a verbal commitment from the agency and that "things look good." He expects written approval soon from it and the state Library Board.

The council and the City Library Board will meet Monday to re-examine the basic plans for the building on Main Street and study the contracts for it.

In March, plans for the new library hit a snag when an insufficient easement to the adjoining property was discovered. The state feared the brick structure would be a fire hazard to any building put in on the vacant lot owned by the Odd Fellows Hall next door.

But in June, the Odd Fellows agreed to a capacity of the present, antiquated library, located behind City Hall.

Fort called library use by residents "phenomenal" and unique for a small town.

remodeling of the building could take 90 days. It will cost about \$55,000.

The city had purchased the old Westwood Building Supply structure at 219 Main St. for \$20,000 to remodel and turn into the new library.

The city bought the property from the bankrupt estate of Ken Ellis in 1985 with money from federal and state revenue sharing funds.

The original plans were for the library to be dedicated during Filer's annual July celebration.

Mayor Robert Fort said the city will look at plans to make the structure energy efficient. He said work could start immediately when the city receives formal approval from the state.

This is the third time the state has examined Filer's plans for the new library. The first time, plans did not meet plumbing standards, so they were corrected and resubmitted to the new administration under Gov. Cecil Andrus.

The remodeled building will nearly double the city's library space, said Fort.

In other news: The council approved a "Peeping-Tom" ordinance for the city.

Fort said there have been complaints of people peeping through windows at night. But because there was no state law or city regulation on the crime, the new regulation was passed.

The council de-annexed land given by a resident to the Filer School District.

The district had purchased the agricultural parcel for expansion, but later decided not to use it.

By approving the de-annexation, the land will not be used for city purposes and will be taken off the tax rolls.

The council adopted the 1985 Uniform Building Code, with the exception of the fee schedule. For that it maintained a 1982 fee structure, which is lower.

The Filer Police Department handed out 19 tickets.

## Vandalism in park sparks petitions from Shoshone residents

**SHOSHONE** — Concern about vandalism at Shoshone's Mary L. Gooding Memorial Park has sparked a petition drive and fund-raising effort.

Jan and Kathy Peyman and the group of city residents have been gathering signatures since the July 12 Old Time Fiddler's Jamboree at the park. The Peymans presented several completed petitions to the city Council Tuesday, asking the "something be done about the restrooms."

The city said the facilities have been vandalized and the damaged fixtures are leaking water and waste onto the floors, creating health and safety hazards.

The delegation suggested the city install a floodlight at the site to inhibit would-be vandals, and the city considered locking the restroom in the evenings. The Peymans also suggested using additional portable toilets for large events like the Fiddlers Jamboree and hiring temporary help or looking for community volunteers to "police" the facilities during such events.

The delegation commended park overseer Curtis Urrutia for his efforts to maintain the park grounds and restroom facilities and said the petition drive was aimed at getting something done to repair the facilities and stop the vandalism, not criticize Urrutia.

Councilman Jerry Baltazor told the group the city had discussed additional portable facilities for the annual fiddlers event and would work with the Chamber of Commerce, which sponsors the event, to get more facilities next year.

"People need to take some pride in the facility and help stop the vandalism and notify us when they see someone doing damage," Baltazor said.

Mayor Tim Ridinger told the group he has opposed locking the facility because it often serves Arm-12 Old Time Fiddler's Jamboree and other travelers, and he has felt it should be open at least as long as the park is open. He agreed the damaged facilities can affect out-of-town visitors' view of the city and said city crews were working to repair the damage.

He checked the restrooms about 8 in the morning of the Fiddlers and everything was okay. Much of that vandalism occurred in broad daylight with the park full of people. Shoshone residents are going to have to care enough to help stop some of this," Ridinger said.

## Hagerman mayor says mobile home must go

**HAGERMAN** — A mobile home for a 91-year-old woman that is set partially on a city street right-of-way will have to be moved, the mayor of Hagerman has decided.

Ervin Shotwell asked the council Tuesday for temporary permission to leave a recently installed mobile home on the back of her corner lot, along an alley and adjacent to a city street.

City Building Inspector Howard Winsor said he approved the mobile home's location because, in his opinion, it did not create a hazard.

Council members Gloria Jarzwick and Audrey Hoffman voted against the request, saying the home extends onto the city street right-of-way and does not conform to the city's 20-foot setback ordinance. It is a citizen's responsibility to know the city's ordinances, they said.

Bill Wilson voted to let the home stay because the situation is temporary. Shotwell said she got the home for her mother, age 91, to live in and the home probably will not be used for a long time.

Rolly Zollinger also voted to let the mobile home stay, saying

Shotwell said the home was purchased and installed, based on that council decision. There is only one possible location on the property for the 56-foot mobile home, she said.

Mayor Merle Owsley cast a tie-breaking vote against Shotwell, saying city ordinances must be followed.

"I have to go according to the code," he said. "I've got to say no."

Owsley said he had thought the trailer would be put on the east side of Shotwell's house, and Shotwell contended her request had stated the mobile home would be along the alley.

The east side, she said, has trees and a flower garden that would have to be "torn out."

Shotwell later said she was unaware of the setback ordinance, and no one told her about it, even when the city superintendent installed her water and sewer lines for the mobile home.

Owsley and Jarzwick and Hoffman also voted to let the mobile home stay, saying "I have to go according to the code." • See MOVE on Page B2

# Ketchum police get reports of murder suspect in area

**KETCHUM** — Police Chief Cal Nevada of Ketchum said Thursday he has had reports of Darren O'Neal, wanted by the FBI and other agencies for a series of murders, being seen in Ketchum.

However, he is not sure if the reports are correct. At any rate, he said, each is being carefully investigated, including the report of an assault of a young Ketchum woman last Friday night.

Nevada said he believes that if O'Neal was in the area, he has gone.

"We have had some reports since Monday from people who believe they may have seen the wanted man in the community, but most have been calls from people who read or heard of reports that he may have been seen here last week.

The people read the information and have then called to say they, too, saw someone fitting the description, but that the sighting occurred last week or earlier," Nevada said.

He said on Friday night a young Boise woman, in her 20s, reported she was grabbed by an individual as she walked past an alley on Sun Valley Road. He said the woman was unharmed other than some scratches on her legs, but was badly frightened.

He said the woman reported the man grabbed her, threw her to the ground and sat on her. Nevada said she struggled with the individual, and it appears the man let her go after the struggle. The woman told officers her assailant had a knife that he twirled at the end of a leather thong.

Nevada said it did not appear the man intended to rape the young woman since she was assaulted in a public place near a busy street, and that it may have been more of a psychological move by someone who dislikes women and enjoys terrorizing them. From available information, he said, this also fits the O'Neal method of operation although his actions often do lead to death for his victims.

O'Neal is wanted by the FBI and authorities in Colorado and Washington in connection with murders. He is also wanted by authorities in Mountain Home and LaGrande, Ore., for questioning in the death of Lia Szubert, a former Twin Falls woman who was abducted near Mountain Home in May and murdered.

Like O'Neal, the subject described in the Ketchum assault, was said to be "clean cut," well dressed and well groomed. Nevada said others reporting possible sightings of O'Neal listed the same qualities. Nevada said the descriptions given by the woman and by others who believe they saw O'Neal match Federal Bureau of Investigation wanted bulletins on the suspect.

FBI officers made an investigation in the Ketchum area and concluded that if O'Neal was in the area, he had left.

"We aren't sure he was over in this area, but there is a good chance he was, and of course there is a chance he was not. We can't be sure," Nevada said.

The woman who was grabbed shortly after she walked from a Ketchum bar could not give a good description because of the struggle and the darkness, the officer said. He added that the star tattoo below O'Neal's left eye is very tiny and might not be seen under such circumstances.

O'Neal is also reported to have the letters "J-U-N-E" tattooed across the knuckles of his left hand.

Shortly after the Szubert murder and after wanted posters appeared in this area on O'Neal, several possible sightings were reported in Burley. On one occasion officers in Minidoka County questioned a young man and said he closely resembled O'Neal, but that he was not the suspect and was released after questioning.

### Phone call orders robbery

**RUPERT** — Something new in criminal technology robbery by telephone was reported by Rupert police Thursday.

The unusual procedure was reported to Rupert city officers about 10:45 p.m. Wednesday by the night clerk at the Maverick store on F Street and Scott Avenue. Police Chief Paul Fries said his department received a call from the clerk saying the store had just been robbed. The woman explained that she had received a telephone call threatening her life if she did not cooperate.

She said the caller told her to take a specific amount of money and put it in a paper sack and then place it in the telephone booth near the store. Fries said the woman said she complied with the order, and the undisclosed amount of cash was apparently picked up.

The clerk said she was told there was an individual outside with a gun on her and not to make any false moves. Rupert officials said they could not release the name of the woman or the amount of money involved since the incident was still under investigation later Thursday.

### Home burglaries reported

**TWIN FALLS** — Donna Lee Tucker, of 911 Wood River Drive, told police someone entered her home between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. Tuesday and took jewelry valued at \$1,100.

Police said there was no sign of forced entry and it

was not known how the thief gained entry. The woman said when she left for work the rings were on the bathroom counter, but they were gone when she returned.

Another Twin Falls resident, David Tracy of 149 Robbin St., told police someone entered his home earlier in the week and took an estimated \$100 worth of food, clothing and household supplies.

### Jones issues draft warning

**IDAHO FALLS** — Attorney General Jim Jones is warning Idaho farmers not to use so-called "right drafts" or "bills of exchange" being issued by an unregistered financial organization called Common Title Bond and Trust, P.C.

The group, which has offices in Sacramento and a mail drop in Carson City, Nev., has told farmers they can present the drafts to banks to satisfy debts, Jones said.

However, Federal Reserve banks will not honor either type of instrument from Common Title, essentially making them worthless as money, Jones said. He also cautioned Idaho banks against accepting the drafts or bills.

Common Title gives the drafts, which resemble checks, to farmers in exchange for promissory notes or deeds of trust. The company has issued bills of exchange to banks who want to redeem the drafts, along with instructions to present the bills to a Federal Reserve.

Common Title also is not registered either as a bank or a business in Idaho. The state is cooperating with federal investigators, including the FBI, in investigating the company, Jones announced.

three to four feet in diameter down to mineral soil and smoke only within that area.

Campers should drown campfires, stir them and test them with hands for heat. The forest service also reminds people that spark arrestors are required on motorcycles and chainsaws.

Despite this year's dangers, so far the number of fires in the forest is lower than at this time last year.

"This year we are extremely fortunate. We have had very few fires and the ones we have had are small ones that we have gotten to right away," Waldrop says.

By this time last year there were 193 acres burned, compared to 10 acres so far this year, he says. Ten fires were caused by lightning this year and four were caused by people.

The Sawtooth has 44 fewer peo-

ple to fight fires this year because firefighters have been needed to fight forest fires in the Boise National Forest.

wick looked at the home, she said, and the mayor gave me the impression it was right. Shotwell said the denial was "a complete surprise" and she plans to pursue the matter legally.

## Bobby — the winless — Wadkins goes ahead in first round of PGA tourney

PALM BEACH GARDENS, Fla. (AP) — Take Ray Floyd's word for it: timing was the key.

"The late players got the worst of it. The people who got out early, they had a terrific advantage," said Floyd, the only late starter able to gain a place among the leaders Thursday in the first round of the 69th PGA national championship.

"The greens, the heat, the wind, everything is tougher in the afternoon," said Floyd, 44, who counts two PGA championships among his four major titles.

Thursday's scores supported his analysis.

Of the nine leading scorers, only Floyd played under the more difficult afternoon conditions, when the heat was more severe and the greens had deteriorated.

"The greens were very bumpy. There were a lot of spike marks. Some were crusty. Overall, they were not good," said Floyd, whose solid-70 left him two strokes back of Bobby Wadkins' leading 68.

"Playing early was a good break for me," the 36-year-old Wadkins, not yet a winner in a 13-year PGA Tour career, said.

"The wind didn't kick up until about the last three holes, and the greens were as good as they're going to be," he said.

Wadkins also missed the worst of the heat and humidity, which Arnold Palmer called "the worst I can recall in 57 years."

Temperatures were over 90 and humidity was listed at more than 90 percent early in the day.

Wadkins was more concerned with the condition of the course at the PGA National Golf Club.

"The fairways were perfect, the rough unplayable and the greens so-so," Wadkins said.

He let only two shots stray into the deep Bermuda grass rough, and each produced a bogey.

But his two-putt birdie-4 on the final hole lifted him one stroke in front early in the day and the afternoon conditions took care of the rest of it. The players will switch starting times Friday, with Floyd playing early and the other leaders late.

"Journeyman touring pro Dave Edwards and University of Maryland golf coach Fred Funk shared second at 69, three under par.

Tied with Floyd at 70 were Tom Watson, needing a victory in this event to complete a career sweep of golf's Big Four titles; West German Bernhard Langer, who had a share of the lead until a bogey-bogey finish; Larry Nelson, a former PGA champ and Bobby's older brother; Larry Nelson, a previous winner of the PGA and U.S. Open titles; and Curtis Strange, who scored his second victory of the season last week in oppressive heat at Memphis, Tenn.

"This was nowhere near as bad as Memphis," Strange said. "Just a routine summer day."

But Watson, who played a little later in the morning, when the heat began to increase, disagreed.

"The heat affected me more than any other round I've played," Watson said. "I felt rubbery out there. I didn't feel dizzy, but I felt drained. That's probably the hottest I've ever been on a golf course."

And it was more taxing later on, if scores are to be believed.

Paul Azinger, this year's leading money-winner, sweated to an 82. Defending champion Bob Twyatt shot a 78, as did U.S. Open champion Scott Simpson. Larry Mize, the Masters champ, was three shots better at 75.

All played in the afternoon.

So did Ben Crenshaw, Tom Kite and Seve Ballesteros of Spain, who all matched par with 72s. Australian Greg Norman and British Open champ Nick Faldo of England had 73s, also in the afternoon.

Arnold Palmer and Jack Nicklaus played with Watson in a morning threesome that drew the vast bulk of the gallery.

"There was a lot of tradition in that group, a lot of history in that group, a lot of heritage in that group," Watson said. "We had a good time today."

Nicklaus, a five-time winner of this title, and Palmer, 67, had a little less fun, however. Each struggled to a 76.

"What I did on the back nine was ridiculous," Nicklaus said after a 40 over the final nine holes. "I gave away everything that could be given away."

For one brief moment, however, Palmer recaptured some of the magic that helped make him golf's most popular player. He hit a 3-wood second shot to the green on the par-5 11th, then held a 40-foot eagle putt.

The old champion did a happy little dance, smiled broadly and bowed from the waist.

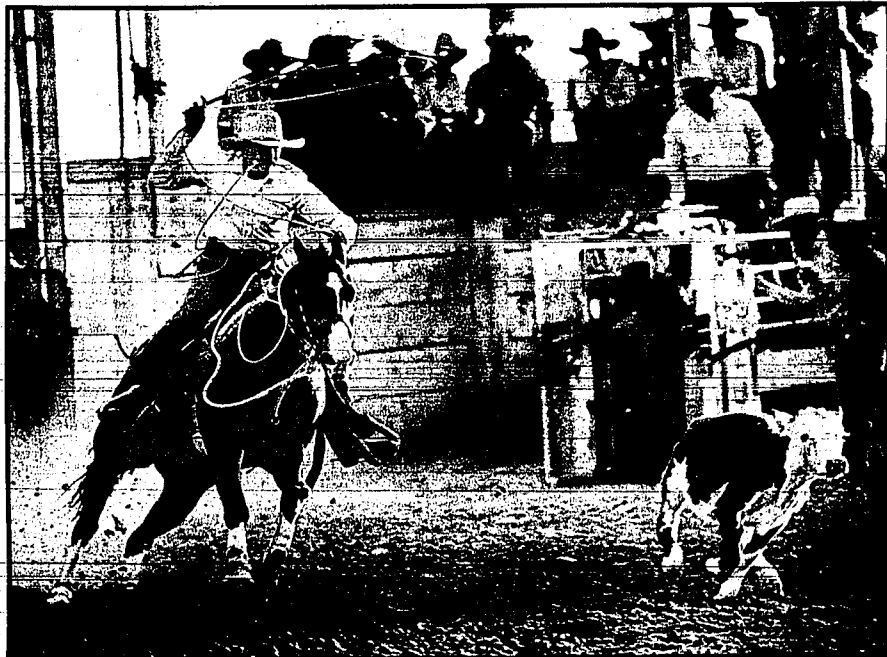
Watson, trying to snap a three-year non-winning string, said he "got out with a kind of a steal."

"I didn't drive particularly well and I didn't putt particularly well, but I still got out with a 70."

He matched four birdies with as many bogeys over the first 12 holes, then birdied the 15th from 20 feet and hit a 7-iron to three feet on the next hole for another birdie.

## Hearn drops one title, sets sights on still another

NEW YORK (AP) — Thomas Hearn wants to be the World Boxing Council's middleweight champion, not his light heavyweight champion.

Responding to a WBC ultimatum, Emanuel Steward, Hearn's manager-trainer, told The Associated Press by telephone from Detroit, "Tommy has definitely given up the light heavyweight title. We already assumed it was known."

It already had been announced that Hearn would try to become the first man to win four titles by fighting Juan Domingo Roldan for the vacant WBC middleweight Oct. 29 at Las Vegas, Nev.

On Wednesday, the WBC announced in Mexico City that a Hearn-Roldan match would not be sanctioned unless Hearn relinquished the light heavyweight title.

"The only thing he's interested in is going for that fourth title," Steward said, adding he would send a telegram to the WBC.

Hearn, a former World Boxing Association welterweight and former WBC super welterweight champion, won the WBC light heavyweight title by stopping Dennis Andrijs of Britain in the 10th round March 7 at Detroit.

The WBC middleweight title became vacant when Sugar Ray Leonard retired after upsetting Maroulo Marvin Hagler on a 12-round split decision April 6 at Las Vegas.

Hagler had been the undisputed champion, but the WBA stripped Hagler before the fight, and the International Boxing Federation declared the title vacant after Leonard won.

Should Hearn make history by beating Roldan — there have been nine triple champions — he would be interested in challenging undisputed heavyweight champion Mike Tyson, according to Steward.

"He believes that if Tyson hasn't been beaten in 15 months he has the style to beat him," Steward said. "I said, 'Are you kidding?' But he said he could get up to 195-200 pounds. He does have the frame to do it."

The 6-foot-1 Hearn weighed 173½ pounds, 1¼ pounds under the limit, when he won the light heavyweight title. The middleweight limit is 160 pounds, while the welterweight limit is 147 and the super welterweight limit 154.

As for defending the middleweight title, should he beat Roldan, Steward said. "He only wants to defend against Hagler. He wants that fight so bad he can't taste it."

Then Steward thought-of-another middleweight challenger Hearn would readily accept — Leonard.

Hagler knocked out Hearn in the third round of title defense June 15, 1985. In his only other loss, Hearn was stopped by Leonard in the 14th round of a fight for the undisputed welterweight championship Sept. 16, 1981.

## Texas Rangers ink drug-troubled hurler Steve Howe

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — The Texas Rangers, without the approval of Commissioner Peter Ueberroth, gave drug-troubled pitcher Steve Howe another shot at the major leagues Thursday.

Howe, suspended in the past from both the major and minor leagues because of cocaine use, was acquired from the Rangers' Oklahoma City farm club.

"We feel comfortable we're doing the right thing," Rangers President Mike Stone said at a news conference a day after he and the American League team's owner, Eddie Chiles, flew to New York to discuss Howe's situation with Ueberroth.

"We didn't ask for Ueberroth's endorsement," Chiles said. "We discussed generalities — what effect it would have on baseball, on the Rangers and on the commissioner."

"We didn't go up there to please anybody, we went up there on our business," he said. "We believe this decision is legal, ethical, moral and sound."

But Chiles said the team had not consulted legal counsel on the decision. And none of the Rangers' officials at the Arlington Stadium press conference would speculate on what Ueberroth's reaction would be.

At first, the commissioner's office said it was working on a statement. Later, spokesman Rich Levin said

Ueberroth would have nothing to say on the matter Thursday.

Howe, the National League rookie of the year when he broke in with the Los Angeles Dodgers, will be in uniform Friday night for the Rangers' game in Baltimore, General Manager Tom Greve said.

After the Rangers signed Howe last month, they sent him to their Class AAA farm club in Oklahoma City and said they hoped to use him as a starter, even though all his major league action had been as a reliever.

However, Manager Bobby Valentine said Thursday that Howe will be a reliever for the Rangers.

"He'll be the first left-hander we'll call in," Valentine said. "We had a pretty good bullpen before — now it's even better."

Howe said, "It's taken me a long time to get back — it's been a long hard battle. All I can say is thank God for the Texas Rangers. I'm ready to drop the controversy. I'm ready to play baseball."

The decision to purchase Howe's contract from Oklahoma City was made in a morning meeting that included Chiles, Stone, Greve and Valentine, all of whom were at the news conference.

Greve said the Rangers didn't need permission to call Howe up.

"It's entirely in the Rangers' hands," Greve said.

## Pan-Am committee seeks 500 beds With opening just three days away

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Pan American Games officials were searching for an extra 500 beds Thursday after being hit with a housing shortage even before all the athletes arrived.

Because many of the 38 nations are sending more athletes than they originally projected, the organizing committee has found it does not have enough beds to accommodate everyone.

Willi Kaltschmitt of Guatemala, the chairman of the support commission of the Pan American Sports Organization, said Thursday that organizers originally estimated 4,500 people would have to be housed. They planned for a maximum of 5,100, but now estimates predict as many as 5,900 participants will be here for the games, which begin Saturday night with opening ceremonies.

Competition in 30 sports begins Sunday.

"The problem basically is that we're short 500 beds," Kaltschmitt said.

Refurbishing two dormitories at the athletes' village at Fort Benjamin Harrison will make room for about 300 people. Officials are considering using dormitories at Marian College and refurbishing barracks at the village.

Mario Vazquez-Rana, PASO president, didn't like the idea of placing athletes in military barracks.

"I had no idea. We can't have this. There are hotels in Indianapolis," he said. "I cannot accept that our athletes are going to sleep in barracks after they've been traveling all day."

His remark drew applause from the delegates at the PASO briefing.

Julio Cesar Villalta, chairman of the Honduran Olympic Committee, said his athletes were forced to wait several hours for rooms after their arrival in Indianapolis.

"And after this interminable wait, we spend the night in the barracks," he said.

"We take this very seriously," said Theodore

Boehm, president of the local organizing committee. "We've already taken steps to move the very best people managers in the city to the fort."

Kaltschmitt said he thinks Vazquez-Rana will soften his position after he sees the barracks. Several PASO board members joined Vazquez-Rana to inspect the barracks later Thursday.

"The barracks are fine," Kaltschmitt said. "By tonight, I think they'll be in good shape."

Housing wasn't the only source of confusion. The status of Chile's athletes remained uncertain as the U.S. continued to consider issuing a visa to former police Capt. Daniel Zuniga.

Zuniga, who stayed in Santiago while his teammates flew here, is said to be a member of the secret police of the Chilean military government. He has been charged with beating protesters and journalists during a march in 1983 and has not been granted a visa by the U.S. government.

The State Department has not officially explained the delay in granting the visa to Zuniga, a member of the shooting team.

Chilean officials have threatened to send their athletes home if Zuniga is not allowed to compete.

Juan Carlos Esguep, head of the Chile Olympic Committee, said he spoke with a State Department official by telephone late Thursday afternoon and was told there is "little hope that the visa will be granted."

Esguep said he was confused because earlier in the day there were indications Zuniga would be allowed to come to Indianapolis.

Zuniga was not with the Chilean shooting team when it left Santiago Thursday night, Esguep said.

He said a decision on whether to follow through with the boycott threat would be made

Friday.

Women athletes who test positive for the drug norethisterone commonly found in birth-control pills will not face disciplinary action at these games, despite an International Olympic Committee ban on the substance.

The PASO medical commission agreed to test for norethisterone and to report the number of positive results to the IOC. But those who test positive won't be identified by name, and will be allowed to compete without penalty, Dr. Eduardo De Rose, president of PASO's medical commission, said.

The group had not voted to enforce the controversial ban because it believes the athletes rely on the pills not only to prevent pregnancy, but to control menstrual cycles during competition.

"It's not something that they can take or not take," he said. "They usually use it the entire month and they can't replace it fast."

Norethisterone, which is found in 95 percent of all birth-control pills, is not believed to enhance athletic performance, but it can hide the illicit use of muscle-building anabolic steroids.

A group of volunteer security workers left their posts at the athletes' village early Thursday morning to protest transportation problems. The volunteers' complaints centered on poor transportation from their work posts to their dormitories.

John Neighbours, a security co-chairman for PAXI, the organizers of the games, did not say how many of the volunteers — mostly college students who are part of an internship program developed for the games — stopped working between 2 a.m. CDT and 6 a.m. CDT.

"It was a group, not one or two people," Neighbours said.

Neighbours emphasized that "no no message was the security program ever in jeopardy."

# NFL camps: Rams' QB asks raise or trade

Quarterback LeRoy Irvin wants to be traded, especially since learning where his salary ranks compared with other NFL defensive backs.

A recent salary poll of the 45 top defensive backs and safeties did not include Irvin, who started for the National Conference in last winter's Pro Bowl. "I must not be that good because 45 guys make more than me," he told the Los Angeles Times in an interview published Thursday.

"They expect you to be All-Pro and then they pay you like a backup," Irvin added.

Irvin hasn't practiced with the Rams since ending a six-day holdout. That holdout was to show dissatisfaction over a deal he signed in March that extended his contract through this season, Irvin, who is due to make \$250,000 in 1987, claims to have an injured hamstring.

Delton Hall, a former Clemson University cornerback and the Pittsburgh Steelers' second-round draft choice, reached agreement on a mul-

ti-year contract Thursday. Terms were not disclosed.

The signing of Hall leaves cornerback Rod Woodson, the Steelers' No. 1 pick, as their only unsigned draftee. No new talks between Woodson's agent and the Steelers are scheduled.

The agent for St. Louis Cardinals top draft choice, Kelly Stouffer, rejected the club's latest contract offer, which would have made the Colorado State quarterback the highest-paid rookie in team history.

Stouffer's agent, Frank Bauer, turned down a \$1.78 million, four-year deal, plus incentives, because Stouffer was the sixth overall pick in the draft, and the Cardinals offer was only \$5,000 more than the contract signed by the seventh pick, Detroit Lions defensive end Reggie Rogers.

Money didn't motivate running back Butch Woolfolk to sign a free-agent contract with the Cleveland Browns, Woolfolk, cut by Houston earlier this summer, said he considered other things in joining the Browns.

"It wasn't money. They aren't exactly throwing money around here.

But I like the organization and the opportunity to play with this team. I know I'm taking a chance," Woolfolk said. (The Cleveland Plain Dealer reported Woolfolk signed a series of one-year contracts for an estimated \$25,000 — about \$25,000 below an offer by the Detroit Lions.)

Philadelphia's starting left tackle, Ken Reeves, was admitted to a hospital — with appendicitis symptoms. Team spokesman Ken Howard said Reeves developed the symptoms during the opening day of camp in West Chester, Pa.

The Minnesota Vikings got bad news on the injury front. Right end Mike Mulroney, who went down with a knee injury Wednesday, has a lateral cartilage tear and will undergo arthroscopic surgery Friday.

Fullback Hokie Gajan suffered an apparent setback in his attempt to return to the New Orleans Saints when he hurt his left knee during practice. A Saints spokesman said Gajan was taken to a New Orleans hospital for X-rays.

Gajan didn't play last year after injuring his right knee in the 10th

game of the 1985 season.

Seattle nose tackle Reggie Kinlaw announced his retirement after eight seasons and a pair of Super Bowl Championships. The Los Angeles Times said Kinlaw, 32, had 330 plays chosen in the 1979 draft. The Seahawks claimed him on waivers before the start of the 1986 season.

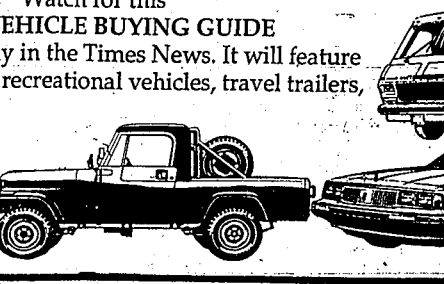
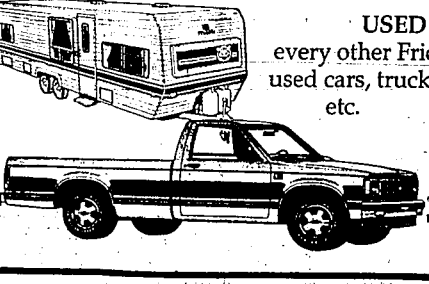

## Sounds for sale

Steve Miller, Carole King, and The Tubes have laid down their music on the 24 tracks of a Sun Valley recording studio

**KETCHUM** — A few people come in the door at Sun Valley Audio looking for guitar strings or an adaptor for the car cigarette lighter. They all leave wondering what this place really is.

At first glance it is hard to tell. There is a comfortable couch, a desk and, wait a minute, a gold record on the wall.

That clue leads you to the owner of the shop, Amos Galpin, who has been involved with music since he can remember. He's the man who built a quality recording studio in beautiful downtown Ketchum.

Galpin says he founded Sun Valley Audio to be a 24-track recording studio where music could be recorded at a quality level comparable to the studios in Los Angeles.

"We're not the same as a big L.A. studio," he says. "You can't believe how much equipment is involved in modern pop music today."

But Galpin's studio has been attractive enough to the likes of Carole King, members of the Tubes and Sun Valley resident Steve Miller, who recorded his album "Italian X-Rays" in a marathon 60-day session.

The gold album, by the way, was a present from Peter Cetera to Galpin, who co-wrote the hit "Big Misdemeanor" for Cetera's solo album.

Galpin says the business was too sporadic to try to maintain only as a recording studio so he had to diversify.

In addition to charging an average of \$80 an hour for studio time, he now provides the base and support for a sound contracting business that pays the bills for the

## The Heaters: Local group warms up act in club, studio

**SUN VALLEY** — There is usually just one good piece of advice for anyone who says they want to make it big in the music scene: Pack up your gear and move to L.A.

But Sun Valley will do just fine for guitarist Ken Martin and the other members of the local group, The Heaters.

Like most-in-the-rock-and-roll business, Martin says his group aspires to make albums someday, or at the very least, to perform their music in some exotic far-off place. Still, there are no practical considerations. Some of the group's musicians rely on income from other jobs, and then there is that steady gig at Whiskey Jacques.

So instead of heading for the Coast, The Heaters try out new material on Sun Valley tourists and occasionally book time at the local recording studio, where they are mak-

ing their own demonstration tape. With songs titles like "Body Bag" and "Lebanon," one might expect The Heaters to be a green-haired gaggle of teens. But Martin laughs at the suggestion, saying that the average age of the seven members is 30.

"Body Bag" is an anti-drug song," he says. "It has to do with the fact that if you do drugs, you're going to end up in a body bag. It's been real popular up here. Everybody asks for it, though some people are repulsed by the title."

"Lebanon" is a song about how insane it is over there, Martin says. "It has a catchy reggae beat that that'll go home humming."

While popular rock and roll groups like U2 are doing quite well with tunes that offer a political message, Martin insists The Heaters do not perform only message songs. "There are so many members of the band, all with different musical styles and tastes," he says. "Each lends his or her own

direction. For instance, we do another song called 'Turn to Me,' it's a classic boy meets girl song."

The group was formed two years ago. "There are lots of musicians up here," Martin says, "We just kind of got together." Performing on stage are: Craig Bernauer, lead vocalist; Martin on lead guitar; Matt Burbank, drums; Mary Poppen, keyboards; Glenn Ashton, bass; Lylo Manwaring, trumpet; Bob Mora, sax; Craig Campbell acts as the group's soundman, and on any given night, Martin says, a number of "Heat-ettes" show up to lend their tambourines and vocals to the background and rhythm section.

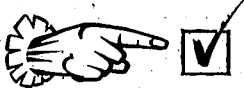
The group's name came almost as an afterthought. Martin says a friend drew a logo which looked like a bunch of gangsters with smoking guns and from that drawing they decided on "The Heaters." But now, he says, the standard joke before the group appears on stage is "Turn to Me."

## Elkhorn Pops: Music on the green draws fans nationwide

**SUN VALLEY** — A breeze stirs the tarps surrounding the stage. Little by little, his audience begins to saunter in — picnic baskets in one hand, wine bottles in the other, choosing their spots on the grass-covered green.

Musicians take their place, instruments resting, as the maestro approaches to strike up the band.

As the music of George Ger- shwin fills the air at the resort green, everyone in the audience taps their feet and smiles as the third annual Elkhorn Music Festival gets under way.

On Tuesday evening the festival marked the first of 14 free outdoor concerts at Elkhorn Resor's Village Plaza. Concerts will continue each evening, except Wednesday and Thursday nights, from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. through Aug. 23.

The festival was founded three years ago by Dr. Carl Eberl of

Idaho Falls and is Idaho's first and only professional chamber orchestra. When villainous executive Dick Jones (Ronny Cox) is asked if he can get military hardware to blow away "RoboCop," he replies: "We practically are the military."

matches what's left of Murphy with a machine to produce RoboCop. Combining the precision of a machine and Emily Pest etiquette, RoboCop goes about his duties, throwing a hostage saboteur out of a window and rescuing a rape victim.

Lewis (Nancy Allen), Murphy's ex-partner, reminds RoboCop he used to be Murphy, so the cyborg takes off after the slain police officer's killers, who happen to be in cahoots with the powers-that-be. "You're a product, and we can't very well have our products turning against us," Jones tells the RoboCop. "The human desire for revenge prevails and the mechanical here embarks on a spatier fest, complete

with one bad guy being melted to gelatin by toxic waste. Delightful social effects.

Dutch director Paul Verhoeven intersperses his movie with satirical advertisements and media breaks: an "orbiting peace platform" that laser-fries Santa Barbara — the home of the retired president; RoboCop's visit to Leo Iacocca Elementary School; a board-game ad showing a mushroom cloud rising from the dining table as the narrator explains the family is playing "Nuke 'Em" — Get them before they get you! "RoboCop" is an unusually commercial movie from the man who directed "Soldier of Orange," "Spetters" and "The Fourth Man."

val in Lake Placid, N.Y., Eberl thought of bringing a chamber orchestra together for an outdoor music festival in Idaho.

"I loved the West and skiing in the Rockies," Eberl says, explaining that he set his sights on Sun Valley as the logical place for a music festival because the area was very similar to the European communities of Munich, Celle, Venice, and Salzburg, where cultural roots run deep.

Now-in its third year, the festival is gaining national attention. Eberl says the festival membership draws from individuals across the country. Sun Valley tourists are beginning to plan their vacations around the festival, with one couple changing their plans to attend the Aspen Music Festival just to hear the Elkhorn Music Festival, Eberl says.

He says by using a sophisticated sound system, it is possible to enjoy symphonic music outdoors with the orchestra's 22-member ensemble. Eberl uses a Boston Pops format for the arrangements, much to the audience's enjoyment.

Each evening's concert are developed around different themes including the year's series: "Musical Odyssey" seven concerts that take the audience to New York, London, Paris, Vienna, Prague, Rome and Moscow; three concerts honoring American Composers Past and Present; three concerts in the Idaho Showcase, an evening "Especially for Kids" and a "Circus Night."

Tonight's performance features "London" as the musical theme with selections from "Simpson," "Haydn," "Elgar" and "Vaughan Williams."

The first concert in the Idaho Showcase series will be held Saturday featuring the American Festival Ballet, with Nadya Zybina and Louis Carlos Astorga dancing the "Black Swan Pas de deux" from "Swan Lake."

On Sunday, the concert whisks the audience to Paris, with music of Bizet, Debussy, Offenbach and Saint-Saens.

Prague will be the featured city for Monday night's performance. The orchestra will play Mozart's Prague Symphony and Smetana's Slavonic Dances and Dvorak's Dances from the Opus 74. A special guest appearance by American composer Eric Stokes is planned for Tuesday with the American Composers, Past and Present series. Stokes will be

honored by conducting his own original works "Prairie Drum" and "Greenhouse Effect."

On Aug. 14 the concert takes you to Rome, with tenor Charles Bressler singing arias from the Italian Baroque. Mendelssohn's Italian Symphony and Beethoven's Cello Concerto with soloist Helen Greenfield will be performed also.

The second in the Idaho Showcase series will be Aug. 15 with saxophone soloist Greg Womack. Villa-Lobos' Fantasia for Saxophone, Horns and Strings and Rachmaninoff's Vocalise will be heard as well.

Vienna is the next stop on Aug. 16 when you'll hear Beethoven's Symphony No. 8, Hummel's Trumpet Concerto and Strauss's Tales from the Vienna Woods.

On Aug. 17 the concert takes on Moscow, with Prokofiev's Classical Symphony, Mussorgsky's Night on Bald Mountain and other works of Glinka and Glere.

American Composers are featured again on Aug. 18 with the Masters of Musicals, highlighting works of Kern, Porter, Loewe and Bernstein. When the kids are welcome at each performance, Aug. 21 is a night designed with children in mind. The evening, entitled "Especially for Kids," will feature Prokofiev's Peter and the Wolf, with a celebrity narrator. The orchestra will also perform Haydn's Toy Symphony and Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Suite.

On Aug. 22 members of the Boise Opera company will be on hand to sing famous operatic arias, duets, trios, plus the quartet from Rigoleto.

The final evening performance is scheduled for Aug. 23 with Circus

Night. The music of Rimsky-Korsakov, Stravinsky, Kabalevsky and Shostakovich will be heard in addition to Rodgers' Carousel.

The Elkhorn Music Festival is funded by corporate grants from the Elkhorn Resort and KIFI-TV, by foundation grants from "Meet the Composer," the National Endowment on the Arts, the Whiting Foundation and by the festival membership.

## Fans pay tribute to movie goddess

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Hundreds of Marilyn Monroe's friends and fans paid tribute to the movie goddess Wednesday on the 25th anniversary of her death, hailing her as a legend assured of immortality.

"Even though 25 years have passed since that tragic day, Marilyn's spirit continues to live," said Greg Schreiner, president of a group called Marilyn Remembered, which organized the memorial service at the tiny cemetery where she was buried.

Bowers of floral tributes banked the simple crypt at Westwood Village Memorial Park.

In a crowded chapel with its glowing room, only some of those who knew Miss Monroe recalled her lingering life and death of a drug overdose on Aug. 5, 1962.

Maurice Zolotow, who wrote the first biography of Miss Monroe in 1960, recalled being awakened by a phone call from a reporter with the news that Marilyn Monroe was dead.

"I just didn't believe it," he said, noting that the actress seemed to symbolize life.

"There was something about her," he recalled. "Her screen presence. A haunting innocence combined

with an overpowering voluptuousness. It was unique."

He and others recalled the troubled childhood and searching life of the woman who was born Norma Jean Mortenson.

"Marilyn Monroe was a restless, quiet spirit, one of those artists condemned to solitude by the rift

God gave her," said Zolotow. In an emotional climax to the nearly one-hour service, which featured a song Schreiner wrote for Miss Monroe, actress Susan Strasberg wept as she read a eulogy written by her father, acting coach Leo Strasberg. Miss Monroe's funeral.

"We have done ballads, churches, a latin disco and whatever comes up," Galpin says.

Back in the studio, two Halley women listen to a cut from a religious album already being sought by distributors.

Bandy Young is at the controls of what looks more identifiable to the layman as the U.S.S. Enterprise, but in reality is the brain of the 24-track system.

Young, who has been in the sound engineering business for 10 years and worked with the Osmonds in Utah, plays several different instruments and is in the band that backs up the Vauriettes here in Sun Valley. He seems to know what he's doing.

The tune bouncing off the mirrored walls (for the reflection of sound) is a religious ballad called "Only My Redeemer." Young is chasing a tape blip, toning down the piano on the phrase and taking out some of the breathiness on another.

"Each track acts as a sound gate," Galpin explains. "When you set it at a certain level it won't let anything in under or over that."

Beyond the wedge-shaped sound room, there are two recording studios with state-of-the-art microphones and a grand piano wired for near-perfect sound.

Galpin says, though they don't have the type of equipment for today's pop music, the studio is ideal for artists who want to capture their best sound. "This studio is perfect for real people and real instruments," he says.

Galpin has become a realist about the business and dismisses a busy recording studio in the mountains of Idaho as a sort of pipe dream.

"We never know who is going to call and want to record. But when they do, we're here."

# Koppel's sharp interviewing skills make most of in-depth news show

By PAUL ELIE

Since March 1980, when it premiered as a series of reports on the Iran hostage crisis, ABC News' "Nightline" has mounted a serious challenge for the title of best news program on network television, a title that was once the sole property of CBS's "60 Minutes" weekly magazine.

"Nightline" allows us to get in-depth on a subject," says executive producer RICK KAPLAN. "We choose one subject to explain, teach, tell and report, and we do it for half an hour. We don't have the volume pressure of the evening news."

Much of "Nightline" success can be traced to host Ted Koppel, who has a way of asking his guests incisive questions without irritating or chiding them. But it also boasts a unique format: one subject, a blend of investigative pieces and up-to-the-minute reports, and an unusual time slot, which often allows the show to scoop the morning papers.

"When a story hits that we consider important — South Africa, the PTL scandal, the Contra affair — we devote resources to the story," Kaplan explains. "Or we sit back

and we say, 'Here's a subject we'd like to reflect on' — a subject that is socially and culturally important."

One "Nightline" scoop grew out of what was originally thought to be a reflective show — the show marking the 40th anniversary of Jackie Robinson's debut as the first black man to play major-league baseball. While discussing the role of blacks in the game today, Los Angeles Dodgers President Al Campanis, who had played with Robinson, made remarks that led to his resignation — and prompted the pro sports world to re-examine the opportunities it offers blacks.

"We had a man on the show (Campanis) who didn't realize the importance of what he was saying," Kaplan recounts. "And we had a Ted Koppel, who knew what to do with it. Eventually you get a track record, and when Jim and Tammy Bakker came to talk to the nation, they went to you."

Before joining "Nightline" in 1984, Kaplan served as executive producer of ABC's "Good Morning America," and as a producer of "World News Tonight," where he was involved in the creation of "Nightline."

"During the hostage crisis, (ABC

News chief) Roone Arledge came to us and said, 'You guys are going to do a special tonight,'" Kaplan recalls. "So we did. The next day he said, 'What are you doing on the special tonight?' We said, 'What special? A special about what?' And Roone said 'What is an ayatollah? Do a special about that.' So we did, and we kept on doing them — there was always something to say about Iran. Those specials eventually became 'Nightline.'

"We've been given an enormous amount of freedom," Kaplan adds. "But there's no lack of scrutiny. If there's a bad period, Roone will let us know about it. He's a parent of 'Nightline,' and we hear from our parents."

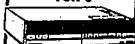

**A.** Probably because Redford inherited four movies turned down by Beatty — which elevated him to superstardom. They were: "Butch Cassidy & the Sundance Kid," "The

Way We Were," "The Sting" and "The Great Gatsby." And the rest, as they say, is movie history.

**Q.** Is it true Grace Jones had made up with her Swedish boyfriend, and is about to embark on an interracial marriage? — C.W.

**A.** Several years ago, when she was queen of the disco movement, Grace ran into a gorgeous 22-year-old Swedish hunk by the name of Dolph Lundgren, who later played opposite Sly Stallone in "Rocky IV." They were together for the next four years, and fought often and loudly. "Lots of drama," Lundgren now recalls. "Serious drama. I wasn't used to that." The stormy relationship finally ended — with Lundgren claiming that he and Jones had incompatible "lifelines." No reconciliation is on the horizon. **A.** I chatted with Hart via long distance phone, and learned that while he was filming battle scenes in Hawaii for "War and Remembrances," a huge TV production based on Herman Wouk's epic novel, he and the crew ran into some wild sharks who became agitated when charges were shot into the water to simulate exploding bombs. The angry sharks surfaced and came perilously close to the sides of the ship; one actually nicked Hart's hand, requiring stitches to put him back into action. "It was pretty hairy and scary," Hart told me from Hawaii, "but now I can write 'fin' to that episode."

# Gagnier adapts to New York life for role in 'Days of Our Lives'

Holly Gagnier is known to many soap fans from her two-year stint as Ivy in "Days of Our Lives." These days she is playing Cassie Callison in "One Life to Live," which meant an entire change of coast and lifestyle for the young and beautiful actress. "It's funny how things have a way of working out when you least expect it. I had finished my run in "Days" and was thinking very seriously of leaving California and coming to New York to study and perhaps do some theater. I didn't know exactly how I was going to work it out when an offer came from "One Life to Live" and everything fell into place."

New York is a big change from Los Angeles, where Holly was born and raised. It's every bit as exciting as Holly envisioned it would be and she finds working with New York-based actors is also stimulating.

"In L.A., the soap actors talk about going on auditions for work in primetime but in New York, many of the people who come on the soap for a few days' work in small parts are also working on the Broadway stage in "Les Miserables" or other shows. And the people, well to wall people in New York. That's the biggest adjustment I had to make. L.A. is so insular. You get into your car and go to work and then it's back in the car and home. You don't talk to anyone all day except the people you see at work. It's so different in New York."

You might say that Holly is a reluctant actress, that is she never planned to be one. She grew up knowing about the business — her dad, Hugh Gagnier, is a well-respected director of photography in TV and films — but she was more interested in dancing than in acting. She pursued her dancing career with dedication and fervor. To pay for her many classes, Holly took a job as a waitress at Maison Gerard, a restaurant near Universal Studios. Being pretty and petite, she was often asked by many of the customers whether she was an actress or wanted to be one. Her standard reply was always "No, I'm not interested. I'm a dancer."

However, one day a woman agent convinced Holly to go on an open call-

With the same fervor she devoted to her dancing, Holly now applied herself to becoming a better actress. She got a chance to act and dance in her first movie, "Girls Just Want to Have Fun," a teen-oriented comedy that has found a vast audience via its cable showings. Holly played the spoiled rich girl who tried to buy her way to the top of a TV dance contest. She danced up a storm in the film and if some sharp-eyed Broadway producer is watching cable this summer, he just may find his next big dancing star in Holly Gagnier.

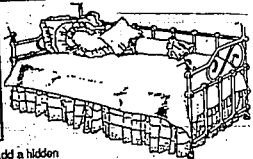

## 'Molly Dodd' bolsters NBC lead

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "The Days and Nights of Molly Dodd," NBC's smart new series of urban angst, had its best finish last week as it placed eighth in the prime-time ratings.

The strong showing by the Thursday night series, starring Blair Brown, helped NBC to its 27th consecutive No. 1 finish in the A.C. Nielsen Co. ratings.

The show's rating this week, 14.5, was lower than last week's 14.7 when it finished 10th. The combination of falling ratings and a rising rank reflected the shrinking size of dog day evening audiences.

NBC won the week with an average prime-time rating of 12.4. CBS was second with 9.9 and ABC

was third with 8.9. NBC also was first in evening news with a 10.0

### Nielsen ratings

average, while CBS and ABC tied for second with 8.7 averages.

The rating is a percentage of the nation's 87.4 million households with televisions.

The top 10: "The Cosby Show," "Family Ties" and "Cheers," all NBC; CBS' "60 Minutes;" ABC's "Growing Pains;" CBS' "Murder, She Wrote" and "Designing Women;" NBC's "Days and Nights of Molly Dodd;" ABC's "20-20" and "Moonlighting."

"Molly Dodd," which has been renewed as a possible replacement for the evening news, was the

only show in the pack which wasn't a rerun.

The NBC Sunday Movie "Three on a Match," which was in 12th place, was the pilot for a projected series, not picked up by NBC, about three men who escape prison and go on the run. It starred Patrick Cassidy, David Hemmings and Bruce A. Young.

"Married ... With Children" was the highest-rated of the low-rated Fox Broadcasting Co. lineup, but finished behind the lowest-rated show of the top three networks.

NBC remained in first place among the evening news shows with a 10.0 rating, while CBS and ABC tied for second at 8.7.

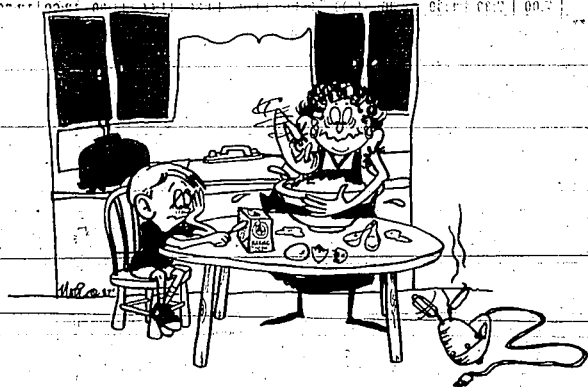

## College football sells out on ABC

WASHINGTON — Writer Dennis Swanson, president of ABC Sports, met the TV press out in Redondo Beach, Calif., over the weekend and had some nuggets of cheerful news among revelations of just how mad 1986 had been "financially" for the division, which suffered a loss of more than \$60 million.

But now, says Swanson, college football is sold out for the 1987 season on ABC. The network is getting about \$38,000 per 30 seconds of advertising this season, while last year ABC was lucky to get \$20,000.

Monday Night NFL Football is "virtually sold out" and, despite raising the ad rates twice, the Winter Olympics from Calgary early next year has sold almost 90 percent of its advertising inventory.

And if the World Series this year goes to at least six games, Swanson said he'd be very happy and "ABC Sports would be in black ink by the end of the year."

And, of course, when you're hot, you're hot. The opening game of the Monday-Night Football schedule, Sept. 14, matches the Super Bowl champion New York Giants and the 1986 champs, the Chicago Bears.

# First 'Superman' drops retirement

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Superman, alias Clark Kent, alias Kirk Alyn, has retired from the Daily Planet and his efforts to save the world from the likes of Lothar and the Spider Woman and moved to Sun City.

Alyn, 77, first to portray the Man of Steel on film, occasionally ventures out of retirement. In 1978, he and Noel Neill, the original Lois Lane, played the parents of Lois Lane in "Superman: The Movie."

Now Alyn has come out for the 50th anniversary of "Superman" and the release of his first movie serial on video cassette. The 15 chapters of the 1948-serial, the first live-action appearance of "Superman" on film, is now on the market in two vol-

umes.

Warner Home Video is also releasing "Superman and the Mole Men," a 1951 theatrical movie starring George Reeves. Reeves, who also starred in 104 half-hour television episodes from 1951-57, committed suicide in 1959.

In addition, the latest movie, "Superman IV: The Quest for Peace," starring Christopher Reeve, opened last week in theaters across the country. (Warner Bros. is pushing the 50th anniversary a little. "Superman," created by Jerome Siegel and Joe Shuster, did not appear in the D.C. Comics until 1938.)

Alyn, a former dancer, made six pictures with producer Sam Katzman before "Superman." As a

dancer he had worked out regularly with weights to keep in shape.

"When he asked me if I wanted to play Superman I thought it was a publicity stunt," Alyn recalled. "I didn't think you could ever put Superman on film. They brought the people from D.C. Comics over and they said, 'Hey, he looks just like Clark Kent.'

"They said take off your shirt, so I did and flexed my muscles. Then the guy said, 'Take off your pants,' and I said, 'Wait a minute!' I was 37 when I played Superman. I picked up that girl and ran up that flight of stairs like it was nothing."

But after "Superman," he was typecast. "I couldn't get another film job," he said.
