Clubs admit women

TWIN FALLS — The Twin Falls Kiwanis Club will reach a milestone next week when Shawna Fuller becomes the first woman inducted into the all-male service club.

The honor comes on the heels of a U.S. Supreme Court ruling that opened the doors of all-male social clubs previously closed to women.

In May, the Supreme Court upheld a California anti-discrimination law that barred Rotary — International — from posting local chapters that admit women as members.

At time of the ruling, lawyers in the case predicted the ruling would have an impact on other all-male clubs.

The Kiwanians acceptance of a woman member follows the Twin Falls Optimist Club approval two weeks ago of two businesswomen as members, said James Bieri, former Optimist president and club member.

Fuller has the support of most of the Twin Falls Kiwanis Club's male membership with only a few dissenting club officials say.

Several members indicated Thursday that while Fuller is the first to break the all-male barrier of the Kiwanis Club roster, she is not the last and several other women will be invited to join.

Dr. Art Frantz, Kiwanis board member and former president, said that while there has never been a woman Kiwanian or female member of any other men's service club in Twin Falls, it was inevitable in view of the Supreme Court ruling.

On that time, he said the club has made plans to invite membership applications from women like Fuller whom they believe would benefit the club.

Fuller is a registered nurse and active in local drama clubs. She is also the mother of six children, including five-month-old twin daughters.

She has worked with Kiwanis club members the past five years as director of the Twin Falls Junior Miss program.

'Friend of America' papal tour

MIAMI — Pope John Paul II, prepared for dissent but claiming the support of a "silent majority" of Catholics, launched his second U.S. tour Thursday as "a friend of America and all Americans."

President Reagan, who had come from Washington to welcome the pontiff on a clear, 93-degree afternoon, made a pointed reference to Central America as he portrayed himself as a friend of human freedom.

"I come as a friend — a friend of America and of all Americans: Catholics, Orthodox, Protestants and Jews, people of every religion, and all men and women of good will," said the pontiff.

"I come as a friend of the poor and the sick and dying, those who are struggling with the problems of each day; those who are rising and falling and stumbling on the journey of life; those who are seeking and discovering, and those not yet finding, the deep meaning of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness."

Many in the exuberant welcoming crowd of 4,500 held up yellow and white papal flags to flap in a breeze which blew the pontiff's white skullcap off his head. The pope did not kiss the ground on this visit, because it was his second tour of the United States.

Security was intense in Miami, and a 53-year-old construction worker was arrested after he was found carrying a gun and knife at Tamiami Park, where the pope will celebrate Mass today. Police said they did not believe the incident was related to the papal visit.

Crowds were unexpectedly light. Some 2,500 people — a thousand fewer than forecast — came to St. Mary's Cathedral for a papal greeting.

Police at first estimated there were 25,000 along the motorcade route, then upped the estimate to 50,000. Police spokesman Cory Zywicki said the crowd grew as people heard radio reports that traffic

was light and parking was available.

But Maj. Ken Forrester, whose Florida National Guardmen lined the parade route, questioned the police department's revised estimate and said the initial count of 25,000 "is a much more reliable figure."

Reagan, extending an extraordinary gesture from one head of state to another, came to Miami with Mrs. Reagan to head the receiving line.

"In Europe and elsewhere, we continue to place our might on the side of human dignity," Reagan said. "In Latin America and Asia, we are supporting the expansion of human freedom, in particular, the powerful movement toward democracy."

The president's aides had said privately that Reagan intended to make an obvious reference to his support for the Contra rebels, though he did not mention Nicaragua specifically.

The two men met a second time Thursday evening at Vizcaya, a lavish mansion now owned by the city — Miami — Reagan brushed aside a reporter's question about the request for \$270 million in Contra aid sent to Congress earlier in the day but later, seated with the pope, the president said, "Just because an agreement has been signed that calls for some waiting, you can't let them starve."

White House spokesman Marlin Fitzwater said the two men talked for about 35 minutes privately, without using an interpreter.

"I assured His Holiness that the United States is committed to the extension of democracy throughout Latin America," Reagan said after the meeting ended.

"The pope and I also discussed the prospects for improved relations between the United States and the Soviet Union. I told him that the United States is unambiguously committed to the establishment of peace during world peace, and for the extension of human freedom around the globe. Indeed, without freedom there can be no peace."

Shultz says \$270 million in Contra aid is goal

WASHINGTON — Secretary of State George P. Shultz, arguing that the alternative is a "communist victory" in Nicaragua, said Thursday the administration will ask Congress for \$270 million in aid to the Contra rebels for an 18-month period.

Testifying before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, Shultz said additional aid to the Contras is the best insurance that Nicaragua will comply with terms of the Central American peace agreement it signed last month in Guatemala.

The announcement drew immediate criticism from a number of congressional Democrats and is certain to produce another round of heated debate on Capitol Hill over the administration's "Central American policy."

Shultz said, "If the Guatemalan agreement is to be implemented in a way that secures a negotiated cease-fire, a democratic opening in Nicaragua, and accommodation of basic national security interests, the United States must continue to furnish support to the freedom fighters."

President Reagan, queried by re-

porters just before he began a private talk with Pope John Paul II in Miami late Thursday afternoon, said it was necessary to seek additional aid for the Contra rebels because "you can't let them starve."

Reagan at first refused to respond to reporters' queries about Shultz's testimony, saying, "I can't answer that. This is not the place for that."

But as the president sat beside the pope in an ornate Italian Renaissance-style room in the Vizcaya villa, he was asked again about the Contra funding.

"Just because an agreement has been signed that calls for some

waiting, you can't let them starve," Reagan said.

The pope, who leaned forward in his chair to hear the rapid-fire questions, did not say anything in response to Reagan's comments.

White House spokesman Marlin Fitzwater told reporters the aid request will "keep pressure on the Sandinistas as we go through the peace process and let them know the president is serious in his commitment not to desert the resistance."

The Guatemala agreement, among other steps, calls on the Sandinista government to arrange a

cease fire and implement democratic reform measures by Nov. 7 — about five weeks after the current Contra aid allotment expires.

House Speaker Jim Wright, D-Texas, who has played an increasingly influential role in the Central American issue, said it was inappropriate for the administration to make a request for more Contra money while the peace process was under way.

"Such a request would anticipate the failure of the peace process and not anticipate the failure of the peace process," Untermyer said.

Hispanic population leaps by 30%

WASHINGTON — The population of Hispanics, the nation's fastest-growing minority, has risen by 30 percent since 1980, with almost one-fourth of the increase coming from illegal aliens, the Census Bureau said Thursday.

The bureau said Hispanics, the second-largest minority in the United States after blacks, totaled 18.8 million in March, an increase of 4.3 million since 1980.

While the Hispanic population was growing by 30 percent between 1980 and 1987, the total population of the country was rising by 7.3 percent.

The figures are included in a report which for the first time included estimates of illegal immigrants in the United States based on Census Bureau surveys and information provided to the Immigration and Naturalization Service.

Jorge Del Pinal of the Census Bureau said the agency estimates that 23 percent of the 4.3 million increase in Hispanics between 1980 and 1987 came from illegal immigrants entering the country.

Hispanics who trace their origins to Central and South America grew the fastest of any group from 1982 to 1987, rising by 40 percent to total 2.1 million, the report said.

Hispanics from Mexico remained

the largest group with a population of 11.8 million, 63 percent of the total and up 22 percent in the past five years.

The population of Hispanics from Puerto Rico grew by 11 percent to 2.3 million, while the number of Cubans was up 7 percent to 1.1 million. A miscellaneous category that includes people from Spain and those who do not list a specific country rose by 33 percent to 1.6 million.

Hispanics now comprise 7.9 percent of the total U.S. population. A Census Bureau study last year forecast that this percentage will continue to rise, with Hispanics expected to account for 12 percent of the population by the year 2020.

'Tailored' test for AIDS created

WASHINGTON — Researchers said Thursday they have developed an AIDS diagnostic test that can be tailored to detect new strains of the disease virus and is easier, cheaper and more accurate than existing tests which confirm infection by the virus.

Scientists at the Research Institute of Scripps Clinic in La Jolla, Calif., and the federal Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta said that the test appears to be superior to the so-called Western-Blot test widely used to confirm infection by the AIDS virus.

Health authorities typically screen blood and urine for AIDS infections using what is called an ELISA test, which detects antibodies developed against proteins coating human immunodeficiency

virus or HIV.

Because current ELISA tests can give false positive readings — sometimes indicating an infection when none is present — scientists verify positive findings with the Western Blot, a more time-consuming and difficult-to-perform test to detect core protein of the virus.

In a report to be published Friday in the journal Science, scientists say they have developed a very specific type of ELISA test that does not produce the false positives or false negatives sometimes seen in the other two tests.

In addition, they say, the new test can be modified easily to detect other strains of the HIV virus. This means that if new disease-causing strains of HIV are discovered, tests for them can be produced quickly, they added.

Study shows American students lagging in science classes

NEW YORK (AP) — U.S. elementary and high school students, especially girls, know less about science than their counterparts did in 1970 and trail both English and Japanese pupils in physics, chemistry and biology, according to an international study.

English students topped even the Japanese in the first study in 17 years to compare how students in 24 nations perform in science. The first phase of the study by

the International Association for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement (IEA) took place in 1983. A second phase of testing was conducted in the United States in 1986 and involved more than 20,000 5th, 9th and 12th graders in over 1,000 schools.

One example of the decline in science knowledge: more than eight out of 10 U.S. 8th graders and nine out of 10 9th graders in 1970 correctly answered a multiple choice question on how long it takes to travel to the moon. But in 1986,

only 47 percent of the 8th graders and 55 percent of the 9th graders chose the correct answer "a few days."

Preliminary test results, made available to The Associated Press, contained findings for only the United States, England, Japan and partial data comparing male and female students in Sweden and Israel.

A 56-page summary is to be presented Wednesday at a meeting of the IEA at Columbia Teachers College, where the research organization is based.

Results — from the remaining countries won't be released until after this year because they have not been made public by those countries, said Columbia University natural sciences professor, Willard J. Jacobson, who coordinated the IEA study.

The findings were based on tests, part multiple choice and part lab work, designed to be hard enough so that the average student at each grade level would only get approximately 50 percent correct.

By that measure, U.S. students,

even those taking advanced courses, were upper in every category tested. First-year biology and physics students averaged 84 percent, and first-year chemistry students 27 percent. Second-year students improved to 44 percent in biology and physics and 41 percent in chemistry.

English secondary school pupils, by contrast, scored well above average in all categories: 73 percent in chemistry, 71 percent in biology, and 58 percent in physics.

Among Japanese secondary

school students, the averages were 62 percent correct in chemistry, 69 percent in physics, and 48 percent in biology.

"We thought advanced American students would do well. But compared to Japanese and English students, that is not so," Jacobson said in an interview.

IEA grade 8 U.S. students did better in 1983 than their counterparts in 1970. But students tested in 1986 scored about the same as 1970 students.

Hart urges U.S. to cooperate with Soviet Union, leader

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Former presidential candidate Gary Hart urged the United States on Thursday to cooperate with the Soviet Union and its leader, describing Mikhail S. Gorbachev as an intelligent man who "represents the possi-

bility of historic change." Hart told the Philadelphia World Affairs Council that Gorbachev is gambling that he can make his nation "a more relevant superpower than ours in the 21st century."

"We would make a serious mistake to underestimate Mr. Gorbachev's commitment to change and reform," Hart said, adding, "There is no doubt in my mind that General Secretary Gorbachev represents the possibility of historic change in the Soviet Union."

Hart, a former Democratic senator from Colorado, was the front-runner for the 1988 Democratic presidential nomination when he withdrew in May following disclosures about his relationship with a Miami woman, Donna Rice.

While Hart urged cooperation and renewed efforts toward arms control, he acknowledged in a brief question-and-answer period that there should be care in negotiation. "We are negotiating with them because we don't trust them," he said. "We don't negotiate with the British, or the French, and they both have nuclear weapons."

After he spoke, Hart rubbed off to catch a train for Washington, ignoring reporters' questions about any reaction to his nationally televised interview on ABC's "Nightline" Tuesday night.

On "Nightline" Hart said he does not intend to revive his candidacy, but would make speeches "to have an impact" in shaping the campaign agenda.

Hart was asked by a council member, before he left the hotel, whether he believed a woman could be elected president. "I don't know," he answered. "I hope that (U.S. Rep.) Pat Schroeder (D-Colo.) becomes a candidate. Right now women are held to a higher standard and that's not right."

On space, Hart told another questioner that the program began as a non-military exploratory effort "and now it is becoming too military and that is dangerous. We need a non-military space effort to find out what's out there."

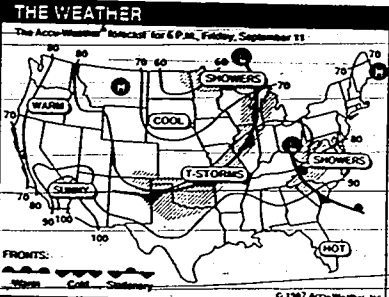

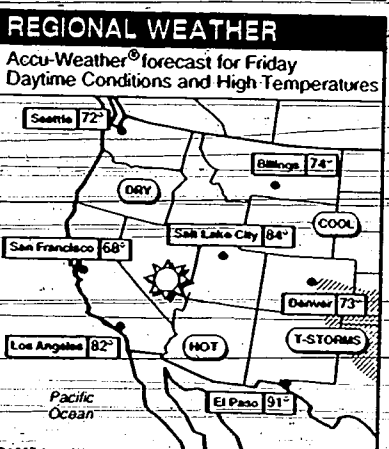

Utah governor claims state on 'short list' for collider site

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — A secret government list shows that despite Air Force opposition, Utah is of the nation's top five candidates for the \$9 billion superconducting super collider, Gov. Norm Bangertzer says.

But in Washington, Energy Department officials Thursday denied such a document exists, saying a "short list" of an unspecified number of finalists won't be drafted until December by the National Academy of Sciences.

Bangertzer declined to say how he obtained the list or from where it

came. He would only say it was leaked from a government agency in Washington.

"We know where it came from, but can't announce that," he said during an interview aired Wednesday night as part of KUTV's special report on the super collider.

However, Energy Department spokesman Will Callicott expressed puzzlement when informed of the governor's remarks. "There is no such list," he said.

Callicott said that the department turns over proposals to the Academy later this month for the de-

velopment by an Academy committee of just such a list. However, he said to his knowledge no such list exists now.

Another DOE spokesperson, Gail Bradshaw, said other agencies than DOE would come up a list of potential sites in the super collider bidding, but "it wouldn't mean anything."

She added that she had no knowledge of any other agency had actually done so.

Francine Gianni, Bangertzer's press secretary, said the governor was standing by his comments.

"This list is an agency's private assessment," she said Thursday, noting that the list was prepared by a DOE "slater agency."

Gianni refused to give further details on the statement or identify the other four states purportedly on the list, but did say the fact that Utah's sites were mostly on federal lands was seen as positive by the makers of the list.

"There's absolutely nothing more we can say," she said. "We are not at liberty to talk about the list. It was given to us in confidence and it will stay that way."

"It came from a federal government agency. We think it's a legitimate list," Gianni said.

The governor's statement injected new hope into the state's campaign to attract the super collider, a proposed circular 63-mile tunnel designed to smash protons and help researchers explore matter.

The Air Force last month objected to the location of Utah's two proposed western desert sites for the super collider, saying they were too near a proposed \$2 billion to \$3 billion National Electronic Combat Test Range.

The project has attracted bids from dozens of states. However, Bangertzer said his secret list showed Utah was nonetheless one of the top five candidates for the super collider.

Bangertzer was given the list about a month ago, Gianni said.

In a news conference shortly before the Sept. 2 deadline for super collider bids, the governor had reporters that he had heard Utah's bid was being looked at carefully.

Andrus, McClure in first contact

No date set for meeting on wilderness

BOISE (AP) — Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus has made initial contact with Republican Sen. James McClure about negotiations to resolve the controversy over additional wilderness in Idaho.

But spokesmen for both leaders said Thursday no specific date for the first negotiating session was set after the telephone conversation between Andrus and McClure on Wednesday.

The governor contacted McClure after completing his review of the nearly 9 million acres of Idaho forest land earlier this month.

Although Andrus has reached a decision on the areas he wants preserved and will put forward in any negotiation, he was standing by his previous statements that he would make no public disclosure of his preferences.

Aides said the governor has not

even totaled up the actual acreage involved in his preferred wilderness plan, but he also told McClure that every issue is open to negotiation.

The governor has indicated he would like to begin talking with McClure about an acceptable wilderness compromise soon, within the next several weeks if possible. But the next scheduled recess for the Senate is for Columbus Day on Oct. 12, and McClure aide H.D. Palmer said the Senate schedule is hectic up until then.

Unlike three years ago when attempts to resolve the wilderness issue collapse, neither the governor nor McClure has taken a hard stand on the amount of acreage that should be added to the 4 million acres of Idaho land already designated for preservation.

Andrus' plan will serve as a "starting point for discussions with

McClure," said Marc Johnson, the governor's press spokesman. "He has tried to come up with a proposal that's both his and McClure's."

Andrus said last month that he doubted if a final compromise, if one can be ironed out, would include as much land as was likely to be proposed for wilderness in the National Forest Service long-range management plans for the 10 national forests in the state. Most of those plans remain in the draft stages, but officials estimated they would call for around \$1.2 million acres of wilderness.

In 1984, conservationists proposed nearly 4 million acres of additional wilderness, McClure came back with 628,000 and then Gov. John Evans countered with 1.2 million. The state Fish and Game Commission recommended 1.8 million acres.

Early this year, conservationists reopened the debate by again introducing legislation in Congress for preservation of 3.9-million acres of the 9 million still under wilderness review. The timber industry has been fighting to keep the figure as low as possible, contending the state's economy will need access to timber in future years.

This week, the president of the Idaho Wildlife Federation recommended the designation as wilderness of 40 roadless areas totaling more than 2 million acres, calling that plan "reasonable."

"We have asked what we need to protect fragile and unique environments, wildlife and fisheries habitats and watersheds," Ket Henderson said. "We are being reasonable. ... We haven't asked for the world."

Henderson said Andrus was advised of the federation's recommendation late last month.

County sets emergency measure to finance work on Pocatello jail

POCATELLO (AP) — The Bannock County Commission will declare a state of emergency to permit the property tax increase needed to finance court-ordered renovations at the county jail.

Prosecutor Larry EchoHawk said Thursday the county will issue registered tax anticipation warrants to pay for the \$317,000 project ordered by 6th District Magistrate Boyd White.

Those warrants will be repaid next year from the higher taxes, which will also finance the \$100,000 cost of additional jail personnel.

Following another hearing in the case brought by a former jail inmate, White gave the county until June 1988 to complete the renovation

of the 33-year-old facility that will include an exercise yard, a law library and fire safety improvements.

White made it clear that he expected plans to be set in motion quickly on the design, bidding and construction phases of the project.

Preliminary architectural plans were submitted during an Aug. 18 court hearing, but White gave county officials and city fire department personnel an additional 21 days to come to final agreement on working plans for the project. Those plans, prepared by Pocatello architect Paul Jensen, were presented to the court this week.

Although the county could have chosen to appeal White's order, EchoHawk said, "An appeal would only have delayed the day of reckoning while at the same time placing the county at risk of being held liable for a great amount of damages

as the result of a lawsuit filed by a jail inmate."

EchoHawk called remodeling the jail just "a stopgap measure," believing that ultimately commissioners will have to look at finding the funds, probably through a bond election, to finance construction of a new jail. Another more immediate challenge will be securing a detention center for juveniles, he said.

Officials have said that if a new adult jail is eventually constructed, the present jail could be converted to a juvenile facility.

Bannock County Commissioner Tom Katsilometes, citing the county's financial problems, indicated construction of a new jail could be some time off.

Officials believe that the county voters are not presently in the mood to give a two-thirds approval for construction of a new facility, he said.

Gurnsey asks moratorium on buildings

BOISE (AP) — Persisting demand for limited state revenues coupled with a looming multimillion-dollar commitment to a new state prison has prompted the chairman of the House Appropriations Committee to suggest halting approval of any new government construction in Idaho.

Boise Republican Kathleen Gurnsey suggested the moratorium on Thursday as the Public Building Fund Advisory Council got its first indication of government agency requests for construction and maintenance money in the budget lawmakers will draft next winter.

"I think we need to spend a little more time on where the dollars are going to come from before we start approving," Mrs. Gurnsey told her colleagues on the five-member committee.

The initial list of agency requests totaled nearly \$32 million, and the state Board of Education has yet to submit its proposals from the colleges and universities.

Unless general tax revenues are diverted to the building fund, as they have been in the past, there will only be about \$10 million to finance work on the 1,800 state-owned buildings with an estimated worth of \$2 billion.

Requests for maintenance alone totaled about \$10 million in the initial submission, nearly twice the amount lawmakers approved in the current budget.

Ashton's hospital to close Sept. 23


ASHTON (AP) — Ashton Memorial Hospital will close Sept. 23 until a permanent doctor can be recruited, Administrator Carl Hanson says.

The hospital will be the second in the Upper Snake River Valley to shut down this year. Fremont General Hospital in St. Anthony closed last February.

The Ashton facility's board of directors, in deciding to suspend hospital operations temporarily, agreed to keep the nursing home and clinic open, Hanson said.

Hart urges U.S. to cooperate with Soviet Union, leader

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Former presidential candidate Gary Hart urged the United States on Thursday to cooperate with the Soviet Union and its leader, describing Mikhail S. Gorbachev as an intelligent man who "represents the possibility of historic change."

Hart told the Philadelphia World Affairs Council that Gorbachev is gaining that he can make his nation "a more relevant superpower than ours in the 21st century."

"We would make a serious mistake to underestimate Mr. Gorbachev's commitment to change and reform," Hart said, adding, "There is no doubt in my mind that General Secretary Gorbachev represents the possibility of historic change in the Soviet Union."

Hart, a former Democratic senator from Colorado, was the front-runner for the 1988 Democratic presidential nomination when he withdrew in May following disclosures about his relationship with a Miami woman, Donna Rice.

While Hart urged cooperation and renewed efforts toward arms control, he acknowledged in a brief question-and-answer period that there should be an answer in negotiation.

"We are negotiating with them because we don't trust them," he said. "We don't negotiate with the British, or the French, and they both have nuclear weapons."

After he spoke, Hart rushed off to catch a train for Washington, ignoring reporters' questions about any reaction to his nationally televised interview on ABC's "Nightline" Tuesday night.

On "Nightline" Hart said he does not intend to revive his candidacy, but would make speeches "to have an impact" in shaping the campaign agenda.

Hart was asked by a council member, before he left the hotel, whether he believed a woman could be elected president.

Several members declined comment on female membership. But Guy Belcher said he is one who doesn't favor women memberships and says it is surprising to him that any woman would want to belong to a men's service club.

Kelker explained that any individual does not just join the club. New member applicants must have at least two existing members as sponsors. They then receive a membership application, which includes their personal history and information on such things as community service, education and employment.

The board of directors then meets to review the information and vote on the acceptance or refusal of the application. Fire crews in Oregon focused on stubborn back country fires Thursday while firefighters in hard-hit Northern California hoped for a dash of rain to dampen large fires still-spreading in national forests.

Dense smoke blanketed southern Oregon and could be seen as far away as Portland, 245 miles to the north.

"We're really focusing on those big ones in the backcountry, which are very difficult to fight," said Barbara Kennedy of the Oregon Unified Coordinating Group in Salem. "There's a lot of work ahead there."

Hoped-for rain failed to materialize. But the National Weather Service forecast a 20 percent chance of showers by Friday, and a 30 to 40 percent chance through the weekend for the area of the Shasta-Trinity and Klamath national forests, which remain the forestry department's top two priority fires.

"If we get as much as one-tenth of an inch, which we're saying is possible, that will go a long way to shutting down the fires," said John Saltenberger of the National Weather Service.

A force of more than 20,000 firefighters, soldiers and prison inmates battled blazes in California, Oregon, Washington, Arizona and Hawaii. Forest and brush fires have charred more than 1,100 square miles in the West.

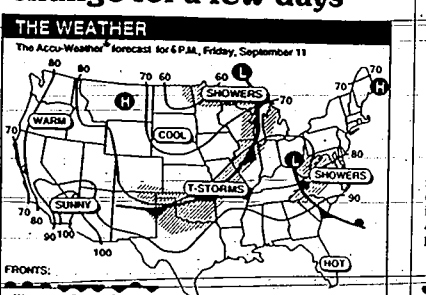

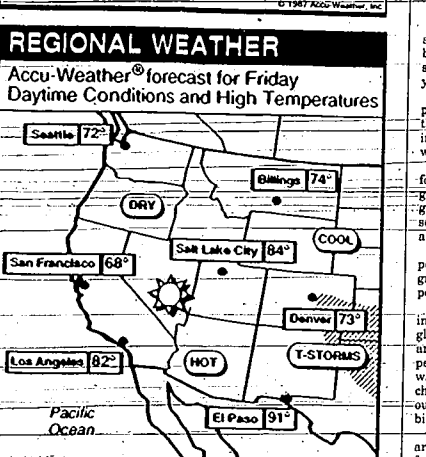

Utah governor claims state on 'short-list' for collider site

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — A secret government list shows that despite Air Force opposition, Utah is of the nation's top five candidates for the \$6 billion superconducting super collider. Gov. Norm Bangert says.

But in Washington, Energy Department officials Thursday denied such a document exists, saying a "short list" of an unspecified number of finalists won't be drafted until December by the National Academy of Sciences.

Bangert declined to say how he obtained the list or from where it

came. He would only say it was leaked from a government agency in Washington.

"We know where it came from, but can't announce that," he said during an interview aired Wednesday night as part of KUTV's special report on the super collider.

However, Energy Department spokesman Will Callisto expressed puzzlement when informed of the governor's remarks. "There is no such list," he said.

Callisto said that the department turns over proposals to the Academy later this month for the de-

velopment by an Academy committee of just such a list. However, he said to his knowledge no such list exists now.

Another DOE spokesperson, Gail Bradshaw, said other agencies than DOE could come up a list of potential leaders in the super collider bidding, but "it wouldn't mean anything."

She added that she had no knowledge that any other agency had actually done so.

Francine Gianni, Bangert's press secretary, said the governor was standing by his comments.

"This list is an agency's private assessment," she said Thursday, noting that the list was prepared by a DOE "inter agency."

Gianni refused to give further details on the statement or identify the other four states purportedly on the list, but did say the fact that Utah's sites were mostly on federal lands was seen as positive by the makers of the list.

"There's absolutely nothing more we can say," she said. "We are not at liberty to talk about the list. It was given to us in confidence and it will stay that way."

"It came from a federal government agency. We think it's a legitimate list," Gianni said.

The governor's statement injected new hope into the state's campaign to attract the super collider, a proposed circular 69-mile tunnel designed to smash protons and help researchers explore matter.

The Air Force last month objected to the location of Utah's two proposed western desert sites for the super collider, saying they were too far a proposed \$2 billion to \$3 billion National Electronic Combat Test Range.

Bangert was given the list about a month ago, Gianni said.

In a news conference shortly before the Sept. 2 deadline for super collider bids, the governor had told reporters that he had heard Utah's bid was being looked at carefully.

Andrus, McClure in first contact

No date set for meeting on wilderness

BOISE (AP) — Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus has made initial contact with Republican Sen. James McClure about negotiations to resolve the "controversy" over additional wilderness in Idaho.

But spokesmen for both leaders said Thursday no specific date for the first negotiating session was set during the telephone conversation between Andrus and McClure on Wednesday.

The governor contacted McClure after completing his review of the nearly 9 million acres of Idaho forest and earlier this month.

Although Andrus has reached a decision on the areas he wants preserved and will put forward in any negotiation, he was standing by his previous statements that he would make no public disclosure of his preferences.

Aides said the governor has not

even totaled up the actual acreage involved in his preferred wilderness plan, but he also told McClure that every issue is open to negotiation.

The governor has indicated he would like to begin talking with McClure about an acceptable wilderness compromise soon, within the next several weeks if possible. But the next scheduled recess for the Senate is for Columbus Day on Oct. 12, and McClure aide H.D. Palmer said the Senate schedule is hectic up until then.

Unlike three years ago when attempts to resolve the wilderness issue collapsed, neither the governor nor McClure has taken a hard stand on the amount of acreage that should be added to the 4 million acres of Idaho land already designated for preservation.

Andrus' plan will serve as a "starting point" for discussions with

McClure, said Marc Johnson, the governor's press spokesman. "He has tried to come up with a proposal that's both his and McClure's."

But Andrus said last month that he doubted if a final compromise, if one can be ironed out, would include as much land as was likely to be proposed for wilderness in the National Forest Service long-range management plans for the 30 national forests in the state. Most of those plans remain in the draft stages, but officials estimated they would call for around \$1.2 million acres of wilderness.

In 1984, conservationists proposed nearly 4 million acres of additional wilderness, McClure came back with 528,000 and then Gov. John Evans countered with 1.2 million. The state Fish and Game Commission recommended 1.8 million acres.

Early this year, conservationists reopened the debate by again introducing legislation in Congress for preservation of 3.9 million acres of the 9 million still under wilderness review. The timber industry has been fighting to keep the figure as low as possible, contending the state's economy will need access to timber in future years.

He also said the president of the Idaho Wildlife Federation recommended the designation as wilderness of 40 roadless areas totaling more than 2 million acres, calling that plan "reasonable."


"We have asked what we need to protect fragile and unique environments, wildlife and fisheries habitats and watersheds," Ket Henderson said. "We are being reasonable... We haven't asked for the world."

Henderson said Andrus was advised of the federation's recommendation late last month.

County sets emergency measure to finance work on Pocatello jail

POCATELLO (AP) — The Bannock County Commission will declare a state of emergency to permit the property tax increase needed to finance court-ordered renovations at the county jail.

Prosecutor Larry EchoHawk said Thursday the county will issue registered tax anticipation warrants to pay for the \$317,000 project ordered by 6th District Magistrate Boyd White.

Those warrants will be repaid next year from the higher taxes, which will also finance the \$100,000 cost of additional jail personnel.

Following another hearing in the case brought by a former jail inmate, White gave the county until June 1988 to complete the renovation.

tion of the 33-year-old facility that will include an exercise yard, a law library and fire safety improvements.

White made it clear that he expected plans to be set in motion quickly on the design, bidding and construction phases of the project.

Preliminary architectural plans were submitted during an Aug. 18 court hearing, but White, state county officials and city fire department personnel an additional 21 days to come to final agreement on working plans for the project. Those plans, prepared by Pocatello architect Paul Jensen, were presented to the court this week.

Although the county could have chosen to appeal White's order, EchoHawk said, "An appeal would only have delayed the day of reckoning while at the same time placing the county at risk of being held liable for a great amount of damages

as the result of a lawsuit filed by a jail inmate."

EchoHawk called remodeling the jail just "a stopgap measure," believing that ultimately commissioners will have to look at finding the funds, probably through a bond election, to finance construction of a new jail. Another more immediate challenge will be securing a detention center for juveniles, he said.

Officials have said that if a new adult jail is eventually constructed, the present jail could be converted to a juvenile facility.

Bannock County Commissioner Tom Katsilometes, citing the county's financial problems, indicated construction of a new jail could be some time off.

Officials believe that the county voters are not presently in the mood to give a two-thirds approval for construction of a new facility, he said.

Gurnsey asks moratorium on buildings

BOISE (AP) — Persisting demand for limited state revenues coupled with a looming multimillion-dollar commitment to a new state prison has prompted the chairman of the House Appropriations Committee to suggest halting approval of any new government construction in Idaho.

Boise Republican Kathleen Gurnsey suggested the moratorium on Thursday as the Public Building Fund Advisory Council got its first indication of government agency requests for construction and maintenance money in the budget lawmaking session.

"I think we need to spend a little more time on where the dollars are going to come from before we start approving," Mrs. Gurnsey told her colleagues on the five-member council.

The initial list of agency requests totaled nearly \$32 million, and the State Board of Education has yet to submit its proposals from the colleges and universities.

Unless general tax revenues are diverted to the building fund, as they have been in the past, there will only be about \$10 million to finance work on the 1,800 state-owned buildings with an estimated worth of \$2 billion.

Requests for maintenance alone totaled about \$10 million in the initial submission, nearly twice the amount lawmakers approved in the current budget.

Candidates in 1988 should address issues of education



WILLIAM J. BENNETT Offers a single key question

Today, in North Carolina, presidential candidates will gather for the first national debates involving candidates of both parties. The exclusive topic will be education.

William J. Bennett

What is the education reform movement about? The answer, it is about improved results. The American people want their schools to do a better job, for all of our children — for the poor, the affluent, and the middle class. A Nation at Risk, the closest thing we have to a national education grievance list, cited, among other problems, poor performance by American students on a variety of international education tests, a decline in scores on most standardized tests, and a decline in student knowledge in crucial subjects, such as English and physics. It is these things that we must aim to change. Whatever changes we make in American education — and changes clearly are in order — their value must be determined, finally, by their impact on student performance, on what students learn. Improved results — better outcomes — is what we are after: Not intentions alone; not action in and of itself; not inputs; but outcomes, results.

children with a rotten education. This must change. This lack of accountability is among the most striking and damaging features of our current educational system. American education and its educators need more linkage between acts and consequences. Schools and educators need good, palpable reasons to avoid failure and they need good, palpable reasons to strive for success. If we are to improve our schools, we must have ways of identifying and rewarding schools that work, methods that work, and principals and teachers who work; we must also have ways of identifying and, if necessary, moving out those who fail to do their job.

Let accountability be the theme of this year's conversation. Let the candidates, for their part, urge governors and their legislatures to set standards for achievement, and hold districts responsible for meeting them. For example, the candidate should get behind the idea that when a district fails to improve over time, the state should step in and take control from the authorities who've made it up. They should get behind the idea that, within districts, there should be rewards for principals who boost performance, and changes where there are not improvements.

Finally, so that we can track our progress toward better results, candidates should get behind regular assessment of student performance; these assessments ought to be suitable for comparisons among states, school districts, and individual schools; and they ought to be made public. I would urge all involved in the education endeavor to remember this: Holding people accountable does not win you favor. There will be complaints. But if we don't move toward accountability, children will suffer. Good schools can save children; bad schools can destroy children's abilities and aspirations. The stakes are high.

from many governors and local education leaders. Education reform is at a point where it requires dynamic and courageous leadership at all levels, and the courage of the candidates will be key. The nation will be watching them.

Allow me, then, to suggest two or three areas where the candidates' strength — or lack thereof — will become particularly evident.

What will they talk about besides spending? I have said that, in time past, education is an issue which many politicians have addressed merely by gushing with sentimentality, gushing all over children and all over the rest of us.

I suspect that again this fall, we will be hearing a lot about education spending. As I've said: The American people have shown themselves willing to spend more. This school year, national spending on education will amount to \$308 billion. In absolute terms, that is more spent on education than any other nation in the world. It is more than we spend on defense.

But, while Americans may be willing to spend more, the American people also are saying loud and clear that, as they spend, they want to be assured that what they are paying for is better quality. Will the candidates who propose new federal programs and more federal spending accompany their proposals with mechanisms of accountability?

Will they withstand union pressure, particularly from the NEA? In recent years, the nation's largest teachers union — the National Education Association — has shown itself to be the most entrenched and aggressive opponent of education reform. Repeatedly, persistently, in state after state, alike, the efforts of Republicans and Democrats alike, the NEA has opposed those reforms which education policy makers, A Nation at Risk, and the American people have identified as crucial to education reform.

Let me mention one issue in particular on which the candidates need to stand firm. That is the issue of performance-based pay. Pay based on performance is the best way we have to introduce accountability to teaching; it is the best way we have to reward teachers who do well and to prod others to improve. Performance-based pay is a genuine, original, and indispensable article of the education reform movement. It is recommended in A Nation at Risk; it has been endorsed by the National Governors' Association; it is suggested in the report of the Carnegie Task Force on Teaching as a Profession; and it is supported by the American people. Yet there is no concept more vehemently opposed by the NEA.

It is my belief that the position a candidate takes on performance-based pay will provide a clear indication of his commitment to real education reform. The candidate's answer to this question — should teachers and principals who do better than others be paid better than others? — will demonstrate his ability to place what is best for American schools before what is best for teacher unions.

The truth is that just as the NEA has been a false friend of education, so has political fortune proved a fickle friend to the NEA. Indeed, on crucial issues, the NEA leadership fails to represent the views not only of the American people, but of American teachers as well. Folls show that a vast majority of teachers favor changes that would make it easier for less competent teachers, and that a majority of teachers support periodic teacher competency tests and some form of performance-based pay.

And for the Republicans. Holding the Democrats accountable for sustaining education reform, then, will mean insisting that they stand up to the National Education Association. It is only fair that I note that the Republicans, too, have at times exhibited an inclination as a party that individual candidates should overcome.

And that inclination is this: When it comes to education, Republicans sometimes speak as if nothing is more important than to save money. Republicans sometimes speak as if nothing is more important than to save money.

In the coming campaign, Republicans must do better than look at education through the green eye-shades of the accountant.

Republican candidates may regard education principally as a local and state function. With the American people, I believe that view is correct.

But Republicans must also recognize that there is a proper, though limited, federal role in improving American education. This does not mean veering from Republican frugality to Democratic profligacy. Present-day Republicans who simply sound like echoes of Democrats past deserve no kudos. As a Republican, I say that my fellow Republicans ought to set forth a distinctive, tough-minded, and positive education agenda. And one part of that agenda should consist of improving the education of the disadvantaged.

A solid education is the surest route from poverty to success — that is one of the chief reasons we Americans value education as we do. Improving our schools is one way — a crucial way — to be serious about helping the poor. And traditionally, Republicans have paid insufficient attention in a specific and focused way to the cause of the education of the disadvantaged.

Research has shown that many of the things that work in general education are of particular benefit in the education of the disadvantaged: things like high standards and expectations, emphasis on the basics, firm discipline, and regular homework.

So all the candidates should be asked this: What will you do to ensure that the education reform movement reaches the disadvantaged? By answering that question, the Republican candidates will be showing a commitment to education, and to the best ends that education can serve.

It may be true, and admirable, that the U.S. considers it a responsibility to keep international waters open to all shipping, but it is disgraceful that we should be bearing the whole burden for rich nations that have a lot more at stake than we.

If Iran and Iraq want to go to war we should consider it their business. The United States should not stick its nose in it, as we surely have. The consequences for our muscle flexing may yet become grave, indeed, for our men and our nation.

Present U.S. policy is unappealing and should be reversed. We are helping the friends of the Soviet Union and injecting ourselves into areas where we can only lose. Instead of helping to provide security for a Soviet client state in the Middle East, we should be helping to oust, in a meaningful way, Communist influence from Cuba and Nicaragua. These governments, with outside influence, are clear threats to the stability of our hemisphere.

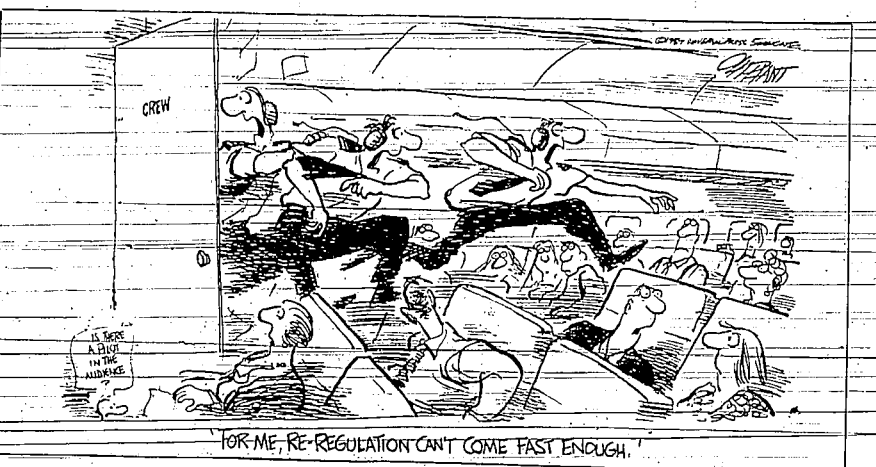

Politics part of process of confirmation

Anent your endorsement of Judge Bork for the Supreme Court.

The Times-News has obviously bought the right's current line — "keep politics out of the confirmation process" — regarding the nomination of Judge Robert Bork to the United States Supreme Court.

The Constitution provides that the Senate, not a gaggle of academicians or philosophers, decides whether to accept a presidential Supreme Court nominee.

It seems to me this position is a cover up by hypocritical, self-styled conservatives who in fact hope the Supreme Court, prodded by a Justice Bork, will reverse a host of positions taken by the court over the past three decades.

Consider the howls from these same conservatives if an American president nominated a virulently left-leaning atheist for a Supreme Court vacancy — and the nation's top law schools have professors who meet that litmus test and are academically as respectable as Judge Bork.

Politics is an integral part of the confirmation process; going back to George Washington's first term as president, when the Senate rejected the president's nominee because his politics were considered unacceptable.

Historically, of course, the founders — about whom conservatives are currently making such a fuss — stuck politics right into the confirmation process.

And, to my view, it is perfectly proper for the Senate to take politics into account — whether we like it or not, a justice of the United States Supreme Court makes policy decisions, and public policy is the field of politics.

What are some of Judge Bork's views that quite properly should be considered by the U.S. Senate? The Sept. 14 Newswatch offers some insight into the nominee's attitude on legal matters:

- He opposes Shelly vs. Kramer, the 1948 Supreme Court ruling that prevents states from enforcing racially-restrictive real estate covenants;
- He is "skepical" of the exclusionary rule that prevents courts from considering evidence seized in violation of the Fourth Amendment;
- He believes that women, unlike racial minorities, have no constitutional protection against laws that discriminate against them;

- He believes that capital punishment is constitutional;
- He disagrees with a Supreme Court decision striking down a Virginia poll tax, a voting fee that had the effect of disenfranchising that state's poor, a majority of whom were black;
- He believes that Roe vs. Wade, the Supreme Court ruling that legalized abortion, was a bad decision (more specifically he thinks the Constitution gives the states the right to regulate or even ban abortion).
- Whether Judge Bork, if he became Justice Bork, would vote to overturn Supreme Court decisions he disagrees with is another matter — although the Left clearly fears he will, no one really knows — but he certainly is not shy about criticizing the court's past rulings.

In sum, it seems foolish to base an argument for any Supreme Court nominee on "keeping the court out of politics" — for good or ill, the Constitution puts the process squarely in the political arena.

Utahn blasts ABA panelists

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Orrin G. Hatch on Thursday accused four members of an American Bar Association panel of being "willing to play politics" on the nomination of Robert H. Bork to the Supreme Court, and he claimed prolonged opposition by Democrats would cost them the presidency and the Senate in the 1988 elections.

The Utah Republican, a leader of conservative senators who will have the role of responding to liberal critics of Bork in Senate Judiciary Committee confirmation hearings that begin Tuesday, first defended the federal appeals court judge at a news conference.

Then, Hatch went to the Senate floor where he denounced what he called an "unprecedented ideological inquisition" of Bork and "vicious attacks" on the nominee's record.

Senate Majority Leader Robert Byrd, D-W.Va., said that before acting on Bork, the Senate should act on the regular 13 appropriation bills, the defense authorization measure, catastrophic illness legislation and an airline safety bill.

Poindexter drew sympathy

WASHINGTON (AP) — After National Security Adviser John M. Poindexter confessed to President Reagan last Nov. 25 of his involvement in the most damaging incident in Reagan's political career, there was no scolding or reprimand, just sympathy from the president and those around him.

According to documents and transcripts released Thursday by the congressional Iran-Contra committee, Poindexter said he was merely told by the president and his men they were sorry he had to resign.

In private testimony taken in four separate sessions last May, June and July in preparation for Poindexter's televised testimony in mid-July, the Navy rear admiral also said he was never particularly bothered by the idea of swapping arms to Iran for Americans held hostage in Lebanon.

Although Reagan has said repeatedly he never intended to approve such a swap, Poindexter told the committee: "I frankly don't find that distasteful."

Sanders describes contract

WASHINGTON (AP) — James Sanders, a former head of the Small Business Administration, testified Thursday that he was contacted by the top White House deputy to Edwin Meese III about a pending \$32 million Army engine contract that eventually went to Wedtech Corp.

Sanders told a Senate subcommittee that James Jenkins, at the time the top aide to Meese, who then was the White House counselor and now is the attorney general, contacted him in the spring of 1982 and "emphasized the administration's desire to see some employment generated" in the economically devastated Bronx, N.Y.

Under questioning by Sen. Carl Levin, D-Mich., Sanders said Wedtech, which at the time had hired former White House political director Lyn Nofziger to help it win government contracts, was "the only game in town" in the Bronx big enough to perform such work for the military.

Sanders said he assumed that Meese, who is under criminal investigation for his involvement with Wedtech, knew what Jenkins was doing in contacting the SBA chief.

Sanders said he also had lunch about that period of time with Nofziger and his lobbying partner, Mark Bragg — who both are currently under indictment for allegedly illegal lobbying activities on behalf of Wedtech.

Demand cancels port visit

WASHINGTON (AP) — A demand by Costa Rica that the Navy certify that the crew was free of AIDS forced the service to cancel a visit to the Central American country by the destroyer USS Luce last week, Pentagon sources said Thursday.

"There is a fear and paranoia growing about this disease that could threaten our relationships with friendly countries around the world," said one official, who like others spoke on condition of anonymity.

In San Jose, Costa Rica, Mark Krischik, spokesman for the U.S. Embassy, contended that the incident involving the Luce had nothing to do with a Costa Rican government decree signed in July that requires visiting sailors to show proof they had passed an AIDS screening test before being permitted ashore.

Doctors express optimism

BALTIMORE (AP) — Doctors said Thursday they are "cautiously optimistic" about the recovery of Siamese twins separated last weekend, saying the 7-month-old West German boys will be awakened from a drug-induced coma over the weekend.

"In the past few days we've seen a general improvement" in the boys' condition, said Dr. David Nichols, an anesthesiologist and one of 70 doctors, nurses and technicians who operated on the twins joined at the head in a 22-hour operation last weekend at Johns Hopkins Hospital.

"We've found no structural damage which would preclude neurological recovery," Nichols said.

The twins, kept in comas to control brain swelling since the operation ended Sunday, remained in critical but stable condition Thursday in the pediatric intensive care unit at Johns Hopkins Children's Center.

Army lifts Apache grounding orders

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Army said Thursday it had lifted a 2-week-old order grounding its fleet of new AH-64 Apache helicopters after isolating the cause of a fatal Aug. 21 crash in Alabama.

Maj. Phil Soucy, a spokesman, said a "safety of flight" message was distributed to Army commands Wednesday night, specifying the Apache choppers could resume flying as soon as mechanics replaced a key component of the helicopter's tail rotor assembly.

Soucy said the Army also would be providing its pilots with some new information governing aerial emergency procedures.

Air raids, tanker strikes continue in gulf zones

E. German chief predicts normal border in future

WIEBELSKIRCHEN — West Germany (AP) — East German Communist Party leader Erich Honecker visited his hometown Thursday for the first time since 1948 and predicted his country will one day share a normal border with West Germany.

In the emotional high point of his West German visit, Honecker arrived in Wiebelskirchen after touring the ancient city of Trier and leaving 60 red roses in the house where Karl Marx, one of the founders of Communism, was born in 1818.

At a dinner later, Honecker said if East Germany and West

Germany work together and abide by a joint communique signed during his visit, "then a day will come when the border will no longer divide us, but unite us." The communique acknowledged strong differences between the nations but emphasized the need to improve relations.

The brief, extemporaneous remarks by Honecker, who supervised the building of the Berlin wall, surprised the 300 dinner guests. The West German television network ZDF said the comments were possibly the most important made by Honecker during his visit.

MANAMA, Bahrain (AP) — Iraqi warplanes bombed industrial centers and an Iranian speedboat rocketed a supertanker Thursday, the day before the U.N. secretary-general begins a peace mission to both nations.

Iraq also claimed its warplanes hit a "large naval target" in the northern Persian Gulf.

U.N. Secretary-General Javier

Peres de Cuellar left New York on Thursday and, after an overnight stop in Paris, is due in Tehran on Friday. He said he remained hopeful that his weeklong mission will bring a truce in the 7-year-old Persian Gulf war.

"I hope that I can extract from both sides a very clear-cut reaction to my ideas," Peres de Cuellar told reporters as he left U.N. headquarters Thursday.

In Washington, Reagan administration sources said Defense Secretary Casper Weinberger also will travel to the gulf region later this month, to visit American military personnel there.

The official Iraqi News Agency, monitored in Cyprus, said Iraqi warplanes scored an "accurate and effective strike" on an unidentified ves-

sel Thursday night in a tanker holding area east of Iran's Kharg Island oil terminal.

Earlier, salvage executives based in the gulf said Iranian commandos in one, or perhaps two, speedboats attacked the Cypriot-flag supertanker Haven with rocket-propelled grenades, causing some damage but no casualties.

Aquino appeals for public support

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — President Corason Aquino made a television appeal Thursday for public support in her gravest-crisis since "people power" swept her to office in February 1986.

"I need you badly," she told Filipinos.

She denounced last month's coup attempt by disloyal soldiers but did not mention the resignation of her entire 25-member Cabinet a day earlier.

Earlier Thursday, Mrs. Aquino told reporters she probably would announce her new government by the weekend.

Two private television stations quoted sources they did not name as saying she would replace her executive secretary, Joker Arroyo, and these department heads: Jaime Ongpin, finance; Solita Monod, economics; Vicente Jayme, public works, and Jose Concepcion, trade.

Air raids, tanker strikes continue in gulf zones

E. German chief predicts normal border in future

WIEBELSKIRCHEN, West Germany (AP) — East German Communist Party leader Erich Honecker visited his hometown Thursday for the first time since 1948 and predicted his country will one day share a normal border with West Germany.

In the emotional high point of his West German visit, Honecker arrived in Wiebelskirchen after touring the ancient city of Trier and leaving 50 red roses in the house where Karl Marx, one of the founders of Communism, was born in 1818.

At a dinner later, Honecker said if East Germany and West

Germany work together and abide by a joint communique signed during his visit, "then a day will come when the border will no longer divide us, but unite us." The communique acknowledged strong differences between the nations but emphasized the need to improve relations.

The brief, extemporaneous remarks by Honecker, who supervised the building of the Berlin wall, surprised the 300 dinner guests. The West German television network ZDF said the comments were possibly the most important made by Honecker during his visit.

MANAMA, Bahrain (AP) — Iraqi warplanes bombed industrial centers and an Iranian speedboat rocketed a supertanker Thursday, the day before the U.N. secretary-general begins a peace mission to both nations.

Iraq also claimed its warplanes hit a "large naval target" in the northern Persian Gulf.

U.N. Secretary-General Javier

Perez de Cuellar left New York on Thursday and, after an overnight stop in Paris, is due in Tehran on Friday. He said it remained hopeful that his weeklong mission will bring a truce in the 7-year-old Persian Gulf war.

"I hope that I can extract from both sides a very clear-cut reaction to my ideas," Perez de Cuellar told reporters as he left U.N. headquar-

ters Thursday.

In Washington, Reagan administration sources said Defense Secretary Casper Weinberger also will travel to the gulf region later this month, to visit American military personnel there.

The official Iraqi News Agency, monitored in Cyprus, said Iraqi warplanes scored an "accurate and effective strike" on an unidentified ves-

sel Thursday night in a tanker holding area east of Iran's Kharg Island oil terminal.

Earlier, salvage executives based in the gulf said Iranian commandos in one, or perhaps two, speedboats attacked the Cypriot-flag supertanker Haven with rocket-propelled grenades, causing some damage but no casualties.

Aquino appeals for public support

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — President Corason Aquino made a television appeal Thursday for public support in her gravest crisis since "people power" swept her to office in February 1986.

"I need you badly," she told Filipinos.

She denounced last month's coup attempt by disloyal soldiers but did not mention the resignation of her entire 25-member Cabinet a day earlier.

Earlier Thursday, Mrs. Aquino told reporters she probably would announce her new government by the weekend.

Two private television stations quoted sources they did not name as saying she would replace her executive secretary, Joker Arroyo, and these department heads: Jaime Ongpin, finance; Solita Monsod, economics; Vicente Jayme, public works, and Jose Concepcion, trade.

Dike Dam developer: Project 'still up in air'

TWIN FALLS — A developer for the Dike Dam project near Glenna Ferry said Thursday he had secured private financial backing, but added the project is "still up in the air."

Meanwhile, the involvement of the project's original sponsor, a Glenna Ferry farmer, now appears questionable.

Developer Bart O'Keefe, president of Mutual Energy Co. of Sacramento, Calif., said Thursday he has signed a tentative agreement with a San Jose company to act as financial backer for the proposed \$100 million, 66-megawatt dam on the Snake River.

But O'Keefe said the project is "still up in the air a bit."

"Now we have to wait and see if we get a new permit," O'Keefe said during a phone interview.

O'Keefe filed for a new, three-year preliminary hydroelectric permit on Sept. 1 through the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.

The new permit is filed under the name Snake River Hydroelectric Corp.

Originally, Glenna Ferry resident Donald Barnhill proposed the Dike Dam project in 1984 and received a three-year preliminary FERC permit to develop the project. Barnhill brought in O'Keefe in October 1986 to complete the permit and file an application for an energy license.

But Barnhill's preliminary hydro permit to secure a license expired Sept. 1, the same day O'Keefe applied for a new permit.

Barnhill, who owns the land on the proposed site, said earlier this week he was still connected with the project.

But O'Keefe said he did not know what Barnhill's status with the project would be.

"I don't know if he will be involved," O'Keefe said. "The landowner doesn't have to be involved to get a FERC permit, and we could proceed if we purchase the land."

The issue is further complicated by a Chapter 11 reorganization filed by Barnhill in Bankruptcy Court in Boise. The FERC permit was listed as an asset.

As part of the bankruptcy proceedings, Judge Alfred Hagan in February approved an agreement between Barnhill, O'Keefe and a third partner, Dale W. Mahon, a Sacramento lawyer. The agreement outlined ownership rights to the Dike Dam project and the right to develop the project by O'Keefe and Mahon.

Under the agreement, Mutual Energy Corporation, O'Keefe and Mahon "are forfeiting a right to file an application on this site if Barnhill is unable to complete the license application within the time allowed by law."

Judge Hagan on Wednesday

denied a request by Barnhill to force FERC to appear in Bankruptcy Court and show cause why the permit could not be extended one more year.

Under federal law, a preliminary permit to develop a hydroelectric project is only issued for three years.

O'Keefe said his request for a new preliminary permit is based on "essentially the same project."

The original Dike Dam proposal was to build a 100-foot-high dam that would create a reservoir seven miles long. The hydro dam would produce an estimated 400 million megawatts annually.

Idaho Power Co. examined the

site in the early 1980s, but backed off trying to develop it after preliminary studies revealed numerous problems, including serious environmental and archaeological impacts.

Studies also showed the project would wipe out prime habitat of the endangered white sturgeon.

O'Keefe earlier said developers would build a fish hatchery to raise sturgeon and mitigate the loss.

But Idaho Fish & Game officials said the hatchery was not enough to justify the project, and they were strongly opposed to it.

The proposed Dike project is about 15 miles downstream from a site now being considered by the City of Tacoma, Wash.

McClure proposes monument status for fossil beds

TWIN FALLS — Sen. James McClure, R-Idaho, introduced legislation Thursday to make the Hagerman Fossil Beds a national monument, an idea that has been discussed since the 1970s.

The bill proposes a 4,394 acre site for the monument containing outstanding examples of fossils from the Pliocene Blancan Age some 3.6 million years ago.

In recent years the beds have deteriorated due to erosion from a variety of sources, including irrigation runoff and off-road vehicles, according to the U.S. Bureau of Land Management.

McClure's proposal follows a public meeting in Hagerman last month where citizens voiced overwhelming support for the national monument idea. A national monument is intended to preserve one nationally significant resource. It is smaller than a national park.

McClure's bill calls for an appropriation for the fossil beds not to exceed \$5 million, according to a copy of the legislation.

Currently, the fossil beds are a national natural landmark but no money is attached to this status, according to BLM which owns much of the beds.

The fossil beds are world-renowned despite their inaccessibility due to a lack of signs. There are Hagerman fossils in the Smithsonian Institution in Washington.

The fossil site was discovered by a local farmer about 1918. It contains remains of zebra-like horses known as the Hagerman horses, ground sloths, saber tooth cats,

mastodons, camels and numerous smaller land and aquatic species, according to McClure's statement introducing the legislation.

McClure's legislation would transfer management of the beds from BLM to the National Park Service.

The legislation allows continuation of electrical generating, transmission, irrigation pumping facilities within the proposed monument. And the bill says these uses can be modified.

The Bell Rapids tract is located on a hillside of the fossil beds. Earlier this year, a landslide destroyed some of the beds and a Bell Rapids pumping station. Bell Rapids farmers use high-lift pumping to raise their water above the hillside fossil beds.

There has been a problem of irrigation canal leakage at Bell Rapids and BLM thinks this could be a cause of the landslide problem. The hillside is unstable and there have been numerous landslides there.

BLM and Bell Rapids farmers have agreed to line an irrigation canal to deal with the leakage problem.

McClure's bill also addresses federal reserved water rights. This is an issue McClure has been concerned about since court decisions backing federal reserved water rights in wilderness areas have been handed down. Communities such as Colorado Springs, Colo., have opposed the existence of federal reserved rights saying they interfere with existing water developments.

McClure's bill for Hagerman says, "Nothing in this Act shall be construed to affect any reserved water right."

Carnival whirl in Williams' blood

TWIN FALLS — When Joe P. Williams was a tyke in the 1920s he would travel up and down the Mississippi River with his folks who were in the carnival business.

Carnivals have changed since the days when they unloaded show equipment — under lanterns — light with horses and wagons, Williams recalled at the Twin Falls County Fair.

"It may sound like a dream, but it happened," says Williams.

Williams, 71, owns Inland Empire Shows based in Twin Falls. The company provides the amusement rides for local fair-goers and countless other communities during a 45-week run.

For years Williams traveled the circuit from South Texas to the Canadian border.

Inland mainly plays in the Inland Empire. West. One stop is at Dodson, Mont., where the census taker once recorded 168 souls. But the three-day fair in the northern Montana town now draws 30,000 people, many from nearby Indian reservations.

Years on the road have taken a toll on Williams' wry frame. But with mile-age comes stories, and Williams is full of tidbits such as why Dodson got the fair instead of

These days carnivals get as much scrutiny as other businesses, Williams says. Inland Empire is subject to state and federal regulations and gets weekly visits from the state electrical inspector.

"It's facts, it's facts," Williams proclaims.

Eventually, the carnival business will be accepted like any other, he says. "It's just like any other, even though we're mobile."

Street would be open in city plan for pool

TWIN FALLS — The Twin Falls City Council got a look Thursday at a traffic plan for the proposed city swimming pool presented to the Twin Falls School Board as an alternative to closing a section of Stadium Boulevard.

Now the city and school district will have to meet eye-to-eye on the fate of the street.

The school board had told the city it wanted a section of Stadium Boulevard closed in front of Sawtooth Elementary School as a condition of leasing nearby district property to the city for the pool. The board wanted the closure as a safety measure for school children and to provide additional parking for staff.

At a meeting Tuesday, school board members agreed they could live with closing the street during school hours only.

The city council on Thursday saw a traffic plan city staff presented to the school board. The plan shows last week that is an alternative to any closure of Stadium Boulevard from Locust Street to Madrona Street.

City Manager Tom Courtney said, "We're at a point where the council and school board need to get back together."

The city proposes keeping the section of Stadium Boulevard open with some changes, such as prohibiting parking and installing 37 diagonal parking spaces and pedestrian islands. The narrowed driving lanes on the street, which would curve around the diagonal parking spaces, should slow down traffic, Courtney said.

In the city plan, students would not be able to park on Stadium Boulevard to drop off or pick up children, Young said. They would have to park on Madrona Street, in

one of the new parking spaces in the existing school parking lots.

City staff also proposed erecting a fence along Twin Falls High School property fronting Stadium Boulevard. The fence would have openings to channel the students to the school sidewalks and is lands on the street.

The city plan includes also adding a turn lane to Locust Street North between Falls Avenue East and Filer Avenue East. The proposal would still allow some parking on the street, Young said.

The proposed changes would cost the city about \$1,200, which includes installing the fence, Young said.

Courtney said the city plan addresses the concerns of the school board.

The plans were drawn up by city staff after a traffic count in the area. The study was conducted one week before school started during the first week of school. The results showed that an average of 1,380 cars a day drive both directions on Stadium Boulevard near Sawtooth Elementary before school started. After school started, the average count during the week was 1,000 a day, Young said.

Courtney recorded an average of 4,136 cars a day driving both directions on Locust Street north of the Stadium Boulevard before school started. After school started, the average count dropped to 3,348. Counts on Locust Street south of Stadium Boulevard showed a daily average of 1,748 cars before school started and an average of 2,648 cars during school.

The council members expressed pleasure with the plan and emphasized that it is an alternative to any closing of the street.

"I don't feel we want to develop this and close Stadium," Councilman Rick Carr said.

Smoking patch only remains of Harrington fire

SOUTH HILLS — The 10,600-acre Harrington Fork fire is dead cold, except for a small patch of smoking timber above Steer Basin near Rock Creek Road, according to Sawtooth Forest Dispatcher Linden Gunter.

"That small patch, within the fire lines around the completely contained fire, will smoke for a few days, but is not likely to spread," Gunter said.

"We've gotten a few calls on it," Gunter said. "It's up in the rocks and too tough to get to."

Gunter flew around the fire in a helicopter Thursday, and said the Steer Basin smoking timber was the only smoke he saw. Two pumper trucks and 10 firefighters remain on the scene of

the county seat of Malta. There was rivalry between the communities. Dodson got the fairgrounds and Malta the courthouse, he says.

Williams has seen his industry change from the era of the five-legged cow and the crocodile-boy freak show.

"Most of it was illusion," Williams confesses. "People were gullible in the '1940s and '1950s. You have got to be with the times. People are more educated," he says.

In the old days putting up a Ferris wheel was a major task. "It took six men a good eight hours to put all that steel together," Williams says. Now the 16 rides in his carnival can be set up by a handful of workers. The rides are self-contained and incorporate wheels for transport on the road.

The industry has invested a lot of money in safety to dispel the clouds that hung over it in the 1940s and 1950s, Williams says. During the off-season the ride au-

UP&L: Rate complaints spur merger

BOISE (AP) — Utah Power and Light Co.'s pending merger with Pacific Corp was prompted partly by customer complaints about the Salt Lake City utility's eastern Idaho rates.

UP&L Chief Executive Frank Davis said in a letter to Idaho Gov. C. President Robert O'Connor.

Davis also suggested in the Sept. 1 letter that the merger is a rate-reducing alternative to the sale of eastern Idaho territory and assets to Idaho Power, a step proposed by some eastern Idaho legislators seeking lower rates for their constituents.

"While the consummation of this merger will not take place for several months, in view of the many regulatory and stockholder approvals that must be obtained," Davis wrote, "the results thereof will clearly be in the best interests of the company's customers."

Idaho Power planning bid

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Idaho legislators opposing the merger of Utah Power & Light Company and Pacific Corp will meet with UP&L officials Tuesday to discuss Idaho Power Company's plan to buy out UP&L's eastern Idaho lines.

"We are still interested," said Joe Marshall, vice president of planning, resources and rates for Idaho Power, which called the meeting.

Several area legislators wrote a letter to Idaho Public Utility Commission President Perry Swisher asking him to block the merger proposal until Idaho Power is given a chance to bid on its own power plan for eastern Idaho.

And UP&L has yet to provide Idaho Power with a breakdown of its investments in coal-fired plants in Utah, providing eastern Idaho's power so the Idaho utility can make the bid, Marshall said.

Utah Power & Light is to present its first written testimony supporting a merger with Pacific Corp of Portland, Ore., to public utility commissions within 30 days.

Utah Power system with Pacific Corp, with synergies and diversification which will allow significantly lower rates for our customers," Davis wrote.

He told O'Connor that "an integral element of that merger is a commitment for substantially lower rates for Utah Power customers."

PUC approves gas for phosphate plant

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Public Utilities Commission has approved a contract between the Intermountain Gas Company and Nu-West Industries allowing Nu-West to buy inexpensive gas, officials said.

Nu-West took over the Conda phosphate fertilizer plant from Beker Industries this summer and began operations in August.

The Conda reopening makes Idaho preeminent in the phosphate industry," said IPUC President Perry Swisher.

Idaho's public and private-sector leadership has anchored this industry firmly in our eastern slope," he said.

Nu-West officials had said the plant would be unable to start operations without access to cheap

gas.

The company also has applied to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission for permission to buy gas directly from producers.

If the request is approved, both Intermountain Gas and its InterNorthwest Pipeline will transport the gas for Nu-West.

Under the new contract, Intermountain Gas will sell Nu-West up to 30,000 therms of gas per day at its large-volume industrial rate through Oct. 31 — this year. The FERC is expected to act on Nu-West's request by then.

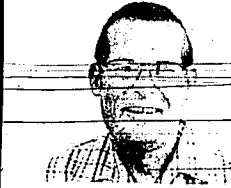

Historical, organic echoes: Mark Sheehan's forged and fabricated steel Construction No. 8 at Gall Severn Gallery

Blacksmith Mark Sheehan marries romance to 'that cold machine part'

KETCHUM — To many, the notion of a modern day blacksmith brings to mind a farrier laboring over the task of molding a piece of steel to make just the right curve to conform to a horse's hoof. To the farrier, his craft is an art. But to the art connoisseur, it is seldom recognized as true art.

Then why is the Gall Severn Gallery dedicating an entire month for a one-man show of the works of a local blacksmith?

Maybe it's because Ketchum artist Mark Sheehan is not your ordinary blacksmith.

Sheehan uses the tools of the blacksmith trade, both traditional and contemporary, but applies the skills and techniques in unique ways.

"I try to come up with a look, a feel, a blend that has obvious historical roots, but it's something maybe you've never quite seen before," Sheehan says.

His artwork for the show, a series of nine modernistic metal sculptures, is a departure from Sheehan's usual fare of functional fireplaces, grates, and lampposts for which he has built a reputation. He sees the sculptures as a new direction for his creative energies and is excited about his first one-man exhibition.

"In the blacksmith trade, in terms of the strict blacksmithing process, there is really only a handful of things you can do with steel, but by combining these processes, the possibilities become infinite," Sheehan says.

The opening of his show begins tonight and runs through Oct. 9. The nine untitled pieces are made through a combination of forged and fabricated steel, resulting in a contemporary look that Sheehan

"There's almost a romance to it — that cold machine part," the artist says, adding that his work attempts to make a cold, inanimate object seem almost organic.

"If it's (the piece) isolated and no longer has a function, and yet it intrigues you and you want to walk around it and scratch your head and say 'How'd he do that?' and it makes you think — then it's something warm," he says.

His works are commissioned by homeowners and businesses. Among those most notable around the Sun Valley area are the lampost at Ketchum's Harriman Square which he designed and built with fellow artist David Harris, along with the outcroppings which hold the sign for Ketchum's Evergreen restaurant and Tequila Joe's restaurant at Elkhorn Resort.

Sheehan is also receiving national attention for his works. The cover on the October issue of Home magazine displays a photograph of the andirons and firegate Sheehan built for Henry Whiting's house at Teater's Knoll near Hagerman. The home, featured in the magazine's inside pages, is the only home in Idaho designed by architect Frank Lloyd Wright.

A native New Yorker, Sheehan, 37, received his art education from the California College of Arts and Crafts in Oakland, Calif., where he became interested in sculpture, especially metal sculpture.

After coming to this area 15 years ago, Sheehan made use of his artistic expertise by painting commercial signs for several years. He finally found a successful niche for his artistic talents when he received his first commission for a fire screen in 1974. He later dropped the sign painting for the more demanding metal work.

Sheehan's blacksmithing talents were once used in an unusual way. Clint Eastwood's film "Pale Rider," Sheehan discovered the production company needed advice on setting up the blacksmith shop. He acted as a set consultant and many of Sheehan's own tools were included in the movie set. As an extra, Sheehan says he did survive the editing process, but he is only recognizable if you know where to look and if you look quickly.

His movie appearance hardly prepared him for the spotlight, however, and Sheehan says he faces tonight's gallery show opening with typical first night jitters.

Still, he is optimistic about the outcome. His next goal is to have a gallery show in Boise. He has even entertained thoughts of leaving the Wood River Valley to "expand his horizons."

But if he should move on, local residents can continue to enjoy the interesting and unusual works Mark Sheehan will leave behind.

Great Rift unites mixed media show at Herrett Museum

TWIN FALLS — Take three Idaho State University faculty members; mix them with a national monument. Add an offhand conversation and a little creativity and what do you get?

A multi-media exhibition called the "Great Rift Set."

The show, which combines handmade paper sculpture, music, poetry and prose to evoke images of the Great Rift National Landmark area located northwest of Pocatello, will be displayed at the Herrett Museum at the College of Southern Idaho through Oct. 1.

Lorna Obermayr, a professor and art instructor at ISU, says she and fellow instructors, musician George Ference and poet-Jenne Goldbeck, had harbored independent interests in the Great Rift area for some time.

"We just kind of got talking about it one evening and it sounded like it would be a very appropriate kind of subject for collaboration," she says.

The Great Rift area, which has been ruggedly layered by successive volcanic actions, had a powerful effect on each of the artists.

"Because it was so strong and so powerful, it seemed like one medium would not be as rich as three media would be to 'portray it,'" says Obermayr. "It was basically just one of those flying ideas that came through. Since we were all interested in the area, we thought it would be a grand idea to work together. We didn't know what would come out of it."

Obermayr, as coordinator of the collaboration. The three faculty members were awarded a grant by the ISU Faculty Research Committee.

The grant funded the costs of the artists' materials, as well as some of their equipment and minor

expenses. Most of the work on the project was done during their spare time.

"We spent a considerable amount of time, together and separately, out at the Great Rift area," says Obermayr.

Last February, after a year of preparation, the exhibition opened at the Davis Gallery on the ISU campus.

Obermayr, a visual artist, says that for her part of the project, she designed pieces of dyed, handmade paper and laid them out in her studio on large stretches of muslin. The wet paper pulp was then rolled into a tube, transported to the Great Rift site, unrolled, and pressed gently onto specific rock formations.

The cast paper usually dried within 24 hours and was "popped" off the rocks. She says the only problem she had leaving wet paper at the Great Rift site overnight was when field mice sometimes chewed chunks out of the sheets.

"We couldn't figure out why they did that except there's a little bit of salt in the dye and they may have been attracted by that," she says.

Obermayr says that her paper sculptures are not to be taken literally. The predominantly gray paper works are flecked with pieces of colored paper pulp and edged or striped with pulp dyed colors such as crimson or coral.

"It's the sort of show to be looked at very relaxed and openly," she says. "In other words, I don't want people going in there and saying, 'Boy, do these awfully like rocks — wow!' They do look a little bit like rocks, but we didn't mean to make a careful rendering of the Great Rift site. What we wanted to do, more than anything, was to capture the quality of it, the kind of feel or

place, the richness, the textures, the about-the-thing, the moods, the sounds, the openness, the things

Organizing the arts: Meeting tests waters

TWIN FALLS — While the Magic Valley boasts a diversity of performing and fine arts groups along with a corps of volunteers and healthy patron support, some are concerned that the area will continue to lose out on bids for new businesses and state grant money — all for the lack of a cohesive arts base.

"We're never going to get Kellwood or Tupperware filled without a broader arts culture," says Shawna Fuller, chairman of the Renaissance Academy of the Arts. Fuller is referring to the vacant Kellwood plant in Twin Falls and the soon-to-be-closed Tupperware plant in Jerome.

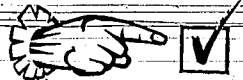
With the help of representatives from the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce, the College of Southern Idaho, and the Magic Valley Arts Council, Fuller is spearheading an effort to form a new organization that will better promote the interests of all Magic Valley arts groups.

Whether the new group will be known as the Magic Valley Arts Coalition, or whether the group will be a resurrection of the MVAC, Fuller hopes that the organization will have the clout of more than 20 existing arts groups.

Eventually, she says, the new coalition might even be able to establish a downtown civic center

"We have been told not to approach city officials until we are better organized," she says.

But, Fuller expects to encounter some reluctance from the more established groups who may not immediately see the advantages of sharing their resources.

"We're anticipating that we aren't going to get everyone to cooperate at first," she says, "but if they can't stand back and look at the

forest and not just their particular tree."

There was no dissent, however, from officers representing local arts groups who were contacted about the plan this week. Most have adopted a "wait and see" attitude.

"I think it would be nice to have a coordinated body," says Dennis Heibel, president of the Magic Valley Symphony. "I just don't want a group that takes over all fundraising for us. That was tried before and didn't work."

Mary Jane Kinney, who was ap-

pointed by the governor to the Idaho Commission on the Arts, says an organization representing all area arts groups would have an edge in winning grants.

"We've missed out by not getting our act together," she says. "There are tremendous grant opportunities available."

Making applications for state and federal funding would be one function of the arts organization, but Fuller says other benefits would include a shared newsletter, a sharing of equipment and, in some cases, manpower, as well as a master calendar so performances and exhibits do not conflict.

"We're not trying to tell people

when they can or cannot schedule their events. And we're not trying to rob any group of its identity," she says.

While the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce will not be officially or financially involved with the new arts group, executive secretary Buz Langdon says he supports the plan because a more organized arts presence could bring business, tourists and conventions into the area.

John Haux, MVAC president, also favors the plan and has called a special public meeting Tuesday night to be held at 7 p.m. in the student conference room at the CBI Taylor Administration Building.

Continued from Page D1 that are all a part of that place over and above just the structure of the rocks themselves.

George Ferencz, composer of the musical accompaniment, uses both acoustical instruments and a synthesizer to create an ethereal atmosphere in the museum exhibition room. The 30-minute composition is played on a continuous tape.

"In any art, or in any creative endeavor, right away there are a lot of cliches," says Ferencz. "I was trying to talk about desolation, loneliness, barrenness and timelessness - but not in an outer space type way."

He says his composition is an emotional interpretation of the Great Rift site.

"It was an experimental thing to try, to see if we could all do our separate art and still come up with something that would fit together without it looking like three different people were doing three different things," she says.

"We were elated with the fact that it did fit together so well - that we could work together and come from three completely different directions and create something that seemed to be a whole."

'House II' buries chills with plot

The makers of what is shaping up to be the "House" series have a novel concept: forget about continuity and go for a generic form. Hence "House II: The Second Story" (good line, that one) has absolutely nothing to do with the original "House," a somewhat funny, somewhat spooky borderline hit from a few years back.

As the ad copy says, "It's an all-new house with brand-new owners," but a familiar plot line about young people moving into an overcast and secluded house with a bad reputation and at least one haunting specter.

Except that writer-director Ethan Wiley plays this one strictly for laughs (witness the PG-13 rating, compared with its predecessor's R). An unsuspecting yuppie couple (Aren't they all?) move into the house, and while she keeps at her career (she's a record company A&R exec), he explores the old family estate and, after a little grave-robbing, winds up saddled with his great-grandfather, dead perhaps, but surprisingly lively after 70 years underground.

As played by Royal Dano, Gramps is the ghost of Gabby Hayes. Between complaints, he likes to drink, talk about the good old days and party; his crumbling facade presents no major problems during the obligatory party scene. After all, it's Halloween.

Oh, about that plot, the one the film's buried in. Seems Gramps and his partner long ago discovered a magical skull that could unlock the mysteries of the universe and bring immortality. Naturally, they fought over it



and set to killing each other, but not permanently so.

As so often happens, the past tries to resolve itself in the present. You know it's today, because one of the good guys keeps an '81 submachine gun in the trunk of his car, suggesting the "House" is probably in California.

Wiley digresses, of course. There's an undisciplined thread involving a miserable rock singer (an excuse to bring in a male buddy for lead Arye Gross). Then he brings in "Cheers" dour John Ratzenberger as an "electrician-adventurer" who uncovers (Grimly) an alternate universe on the other side of a wall (maybe that's the thread between houses: "Cheers" George Wendt appeared in the first "House").

Behind the wall, our intrepid adventurers find some leftover creatures from "The NeverEnding Story" and a Neanderthal man who could have had a future in professional wrestling had he lived long enough. Maybe he did.

At the end, the plot line goes to settlement. Genre aficionados looking for chills and thrills will be disappointed; this one could play uncut on television — network, not cable. The effects and the jokes are equally few and far between, and for all its amiable intentions, "House II" deserves few boarders.

Centennial project collecting Idaho folk songs

BOISE — Although the Idaho statehood centennial is still almost three years away, one statewide project to celebrate the event already has begun.

During the next seven months, Rosalie Sorrells, an internationally acclaimed folk singer, songwriter and storyteller, will travel throughout Idaho doing a series of concerts and song swap workshops designed to search out Idaho folk songs and music.

Sorrells is scheduled to appear in Buhl and Filer on Oct. 2, in Halley on Oct. 3, and in Burley on Oct. 9. The material obtained then will be preserved in the state historical archives. A representative group of

songs from the collection will be compiled into an Idaho Centennial songbook to be published by the Idaho Centennial Commission.

An Idaho native, Sorrells has been performing professionally for 30 years all over the United States and in Canada and Europe. She also has appeared in concert with many other well-known folk musicians and has made more than a dozen records. She has served on the board of directors of the Newport Folk Festival and on the advisory board of the New York City Folk Festival.

Spurred by an interest in Idaho history and in her own family roots, she began researching and col-

lecting Idaho folk songs some years ago. Several of her records feature Utah and Idaho folk songs. The project is being funded by the Idaho Centennial Commission through a grant to the Idaho Commission on the Arts.

Project Manager Jean Terra said, "It's particularly want to hear from seniors who know of songs that have been sung by their families and from ethnic groups about songs that reflect their traditions and experiences. We also are interested in songs about particular occupations that have been important in Idaho's history."

'The Big Easy' steams with duo Quaid, Barkin

TWIN FALLS — The following are capsule reviews of movies playing in theaters locally. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

THE BIG EASY (R). This film has several methods of establishing its authority over your attention: one is the palpable friction between Dennis Quaid (as the faintly corrupt, smooth-talking New Orleans police lieutenant) and Ellen Barkin (as the post-straitlaced, mid-'80s-upright assistant district attorney investigating police corruption). Another is the feeling of New Orleans that goes beyond the familiar iron filigree and the "NOLA" lilt of the voice. Add to these some delectable supporting bits (most particularly by the late Charles Ludlam as the lieutenant's attorney) and stir with knee-bonding sexuality.

FULL METAL JACKET (R). In this film, director Stanley Kubrick brings his rigorous artist's eye to Vietnam to create a powerful and centered statement of outrage. Although its two sections — observing the antiseptic madness of Parris Island and the too-mortal chaos in Vietnam proper — are not perfectly balanced, it is a muscular return to form for the man who made "Dr. Strangelove" and "A Clockwork Orange." And in a superb cast of mostly unknowns, Vincent D'Onofrio and ex-Marine drill instructor Lee Ermey are exceptional.

LA BAMB A (PG-13). Although this film of the magically brief-lived Latin-rocker Ritchie Valens has its strengths, especially the fine turn by the unknown Lou Diamond Phillips, the wonder is that the

movie isn't full of raw energy, that it's for the most part political melodrama. There is the music, however, great dollops of '60s songs, and it lifts the movie when the dialogue and the earnest-but-uninspired direction (by Luis Valdez) keeps it earthbound. Stars Lou Diamond Phillips, Essi Morales, Danielle von Zerneck and Elizabeth Pena. Written and directed by Luis Valdez.

MASTERS OF THE UNIVERSE (PG). A sword-and-sorcery epic based on the famous toy line and syndicated TV cartoon series; in this case, it might have worked better with the cartoon characters in the leads. Or even the boys. Dolph Lundgren, as the redoubtable "He-Man," gives a polyethylene, incomprehensible, nervy performance; and the plot has the legions of Eternia invading Colby, Calif., a town so blasé that nobody shows up for the intergalactic war on Main Street.

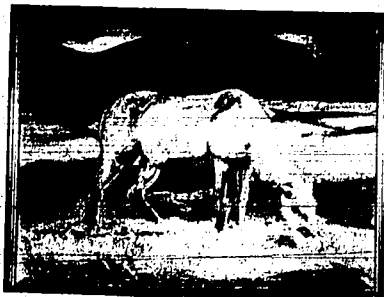

Arts agency sets hearing

BOISE — Twin Falls will be the site of one of six public hearings scheduled throughout the state by the Idaho Commission on the Arts. The meeting will be Sept. 22 at 7:30 p.m. in Room 119 of the Fine Arts Auditorium at the College of Southern Idaho.

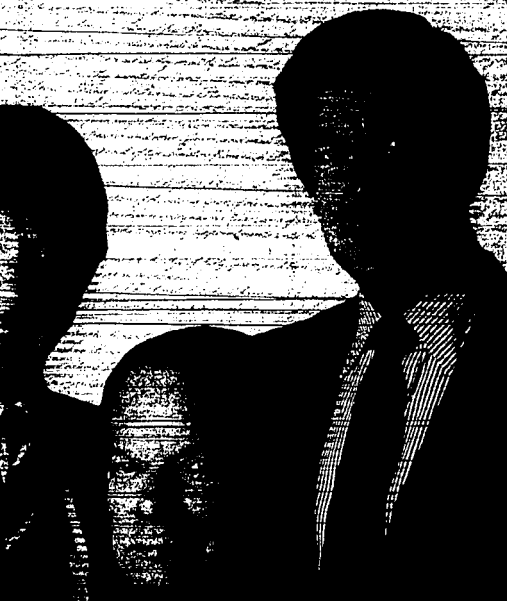

200-year-old Constitution gets many TV birthday celebrations

This week, two prime-time specials mark the 200th anniversary of the signing of the U.S. Constitution. On Thursday, Sept. 17, Walter Cronkite hosts CBS's "We the People 200: The Constitutional Gala," a black-tie ceremony airing from Philadelphia's Convention Hall. And ABC News takes a long look at constitutional history in "The Blessings of Liberty," airing Wednesday, Sept. 16.

"This broadcast is what I like to call a 'single-theme' magazine," says Av Westin, the producer of "The Blessings of Liberty." "It points out that the Constitution is, to use the cliché, a living document.

The "single-theme magazine" format, he explains, blends news and entertainment, using tech-

niques viewers will recognize from ABC News programs such as the recently canceled "Our World." Documentary film footage will be used to re-create the moods and circumstances surrounding recent events, and an all-star cast of actors (among them F. Murray Abraham, San Waterston, Richard Kiley and Martin Sheen) will dramatize constitutional conflicts.

Hosting duties will be shared by three of ABC News' biggest stars. David Brinkley ("This Week with David Brinkley") will set the scene with a historical recap. Peter Jennings ("World News Tonight") will introduce the ensemble cast and the protagonists — a chambermaid in one segment, a laundress in another. And Ted Koppel ("Nightline") will explore ways in which the Constitution affects people's lives today.

"The format plays to the interests and strengths of each of them," Westin contends. "Brinkley is an historian, and he likes doing the 'Our World'-style segments. Jennings is a marvelous storyteller, an excellent raconteur. And Koppel has an analytical mind — he puts

things in perspective."

To keep the three-hour special moving along, Westin has divided U.S. constitutional history into seven periods from 1787 to the present. He emphasizes that it is not a sprawling documentary overview, but rather, a series of vignettes "threaded together like pearls."

"Documentaries, by my definition, develop a couple of themes through their entire length, and then they all pay off at the end," he explains. "This, though, develops each of seven time periods. There's a payoff before every commercial."

This week's prime-time specials are the most prominent of several recent programs celebrating the anniversary.

CBS syndicates "Twilight Zone"




NEW YORK (AP) — CBS, which canceled the new version of Rod Serling's "Twilight Zone" television anthology, announced Wednesday it is taking the unprecedented step of continuing to produce new episodes for syndication.

Networks are not allowed to syndicate shows domestically, so CBS has entered into a partnership with MGM-UA Telecommunications to syndicate the series, a CBS spokesman said. CBS will offer the show for sale internationally.

Previously run "Twilight Zone" episodes will be offered for syndication as early as October. Additional half-hour episodes will be produced next year and added to the syndication deal.

Donald D. Wear Jr., senior vice president and general manager of CBS Broadcast International, the division that will now produce the series, said executives decide to enter into the unusual arrangement because of the number of letters protesting the cancellation.

As kids go back to school, the big soap guns flex muscles again, reasserting authority. After a light summer, "Young and Restless" patriarch John Abbott is back at the controls. He must pull daughter Ashley out of the doldrums and give her confidence and support. Ashley's been feeling sorry for herself far too long. The breakdown is over, gang. John's been a negligent father.

Then there is son Jack, the show's trouble-maker, always overreaching, a little too greedy and impetuous. Although Jack has changed colors since spring, discovering good works instead of double-crossing friends, but it can't last long. Dad's back, and Jack is looking over his shoulder.

Jerry Douglas can assert John Abbott's authority with the blink of an eye. No histrionics for Douglas. Abbott lets the children have the tantrums. Before "The Young and the Restless," Jerry Douglas always played villains, but that was a long time ago.

Boss Bill Bell took one look at that Boston face and knew Douglas would keep all the crazy Abbott kids in line. Of course, in the soap world, the kids must go practically nuts before authority rules, especially on "The Young and the Restless." The Abbott offspring, Tracy, Jack and Ashley, mustn't bore fans, so when they're bad, they're very, very bad. Dad seems to be off on a cloud somewhere. Finally, he calms everybody down and lays out blanket orders. He remains the patriarch. There were never any doubts about that in Bill Bell's mind. Family comes first on his shows.

Secure, with a juicy new contract, Douglas remains a Bill Bell favorite, yet has time for optioning movie scripts. He's still pushing "Walls of Anger," about his acting workshop for convicts. It's too seamy for the networks. Douglas used soap scripts for the workshop, had blacks playing upper class whites, chicanos playing blacks. Inmates learned to use emotion as a form of self-expression and to gain confidence. The payoff surprised Douglas, but the outside world isn't interested.

This fall Douglas touts the tal-

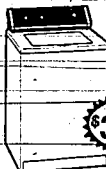

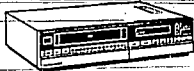

A dash of Creole on CBS' menu

HOLLYWOOD — Austin Leslie, 53, owner of New Orleans' Chez Helene restaurant, complained that the people "up north" in California just do not know beans about Creole cooking.

"They don't use the seasoning properly," he said in a recent telephone interview. "They don't know how to use it, and they don't have the confidence to use it. We use a lot of spices; that's what creates the unique taste."

Despite their base "up north" in California, producer Hugh Wilson, actor Tim Reid and CBS executives here hope to bring a little of the uniquely spicy taste of New Orleans to prime-time television next month with "Frank's Place," a half-hour, laugh-track-less comedy series loosely based on life at a Creole restaurant — modeled after Chez Helene — in a predominately black New Orleans neighborhood.

Wilson, who also produced the late-'70s comedy series "WKRP in Cincinnati," wants the show to capture the spirit of New Orleans that haunted him following an exploratory visit to the city: "That town is all about food, music, whiskey and death," he said during an interview at here. "In the black neighborhoods there, the major power centers are the pulpit and the funeral home."

Reid also found that in New Orleans' French quarter, a funeral could be the highlight of the day. "In New Orleans, a funeral is party time," he said.

Although the series, which premieres Sept. 14 but normally will be seen Saturdays nights, has yet to be sampled by the American public, it was a favorite among representatives of CBS-affiliated stations who met in Los Angeles in June, and again among national television critics who saw it during the annual CBS press tour in Redondo Beach, Calif., earlier this month.

Even Brandon Tartikoff, entertainment president of rival network NBC, gave "Frank's Place" a plug in a recent news conference by citing it — along with ABC's "Hooperman" from "L.A. Law" creators Steven Bochco and Terry Louise Fisher and NBC's family drama series "A Year in the Life" — as one of several new quality shows for fall.

Wilson wrote the pilot episode of "Frank's Place" and will serve as executive producer and a writer on the series for Viacom Productions; Max Taah-is-series producer. Although the show will be produced in Los Angeles, the main titles were filmed in New Orleans, and Wilson, a Florida native who spent 10 years in Atlanta before moving to Los Angeles, plans periodic visits.

Both Wilson and Reid were fascinated by the ethnic mix of Chez Helene's clientele, which they will preserve in the series — and, they hope, in the audience. "It's not targeted-at-black-audiences; because you can't succeed that way, but I want it to seem authentic to black audiences," Wilson said. "We hope it will attract a lot of different kinds of people."

Said Leslie: "In New Orleans, blacks-and-whites-always-did-eat-the-same food."

Wilson brought Leslie to Los Angeles to cook the steaming mountains of food that appear in the pilot episode; he will be the show's long-distance food adviser. Creole cooking, Leslie emphatically pointed out, is not to be confused with Cajun food, the country-French diet of the New Orleans poor.

Reid, best known for his role as the colorful Venus Flytrap on "WKRP" and a longtime associate of Wilson, stars as Frank Parrish, a

Boston college professor who comes to New Orleans upon the death of his estranged father, who left him the restaurant in his will. Fully intending to sell the establishment, Frank is seduced by the food, the atmosphere, the quirky employees and a mysterious voodoo spell to give up his life in Boston in favor of staying to run the restaurant.

Among the regulars at Frank's Place are wheelchair-bound matriarch Bertha Griffin-Lamour (Virginia Capers), owner of the local funeral home, and her daughter Hannah, the embalmer, played by Reid's wife, Daphne Maxwell-Reid. The embalmer was originally slated as a male character until Reid and Wilson met a young woman embalmer at a New Orleans funeral home.

The young woman's complaint that her dates always expected her to have cold hands inspired a scene in the pilot in which Hannah dips her hands in a bucket of ice before shaking hands with Frank.

The rest of the cast includes Tony Burton, Frances E. Williams, William Thomas, Robert Harper, Francesca P. Roberts, Lincoln Kirkpatrick, Charles Lampkin and Don Yesso, a man Wilson happened to meet on an airplane who just happened to have an authentic Louisiana accent. "He had that accent down cold, and I hired him," Wilson said.

TV romance continues off-camera

LOS ANGELES — Michael Tucker and Jill Eikenberry, who are having a torrid affair on NBC's "L.A. Law," are married and trying to kill each other in the movie "Assault and Matrimony."

Tucker and Eikenberry are also married in real life, and both are nominated for Emmys for their roles in the hit series. They are not the only married couple up for Emmys, and far from being the only married couple working together in television.

There are couples on "St. Elsewhere," ABC's new "Thirtysomething," CBS' new "Frank's Place," and "Designing Women."

It can be nice working together, said Eikenberry.

"We've rarely worked together before," she said. "It's nice to be able to go home and talk about the show. You're not imposing because we're both in the same show and have the same interests."

The new season of "L.A. Law" will see their characters, Stuart Markowitz and Ann Kelsey, talk about making their relationship more permanent. But whether they actually get married has not been decided.

Both Tucker and Eikenberry captured the public's imagination with their romance between the elegant Kelsey and the older and somewhat pudgy Markowitz. The "Venus But-terfly" episode created a sensation, and thousands of people wrote in seeking this secret of sensual satisfaction. (Actually, it's just something the writers made up.)

On "L.A. Law" there's more than the Eikenberry-Tucker nepotism. Producer Steven Bochco's wife, Barbara Bosson, once a regular on "Hill Street Blues," made a guest appearance. Corbin Bernsen's real-life mom, Jeanne Cooper, played his character's mother in an episode last season. Both mother and son are up for Emmys. Harry Hamlin's wife, Laura Johnson, is doing a guest spot this season.

In "Assault and Matrimony," which NBC will telecast on Monday, Sept. 28, they play a bot-ting husband and wife whose com-tempts to do each other in never quite succeed.

There are at least five other married couples working together in series this coming season.

William Daniels and Bonnie Bartlett of NBC's "St. Elsewhere," both Emmy winners last year, are nominated again for their roles as husband and wife. If they win again, and Tucker and Eikenberry win, they could monopolize the acting awards for drama series. There is no competition within the couples — Daniels and Eikenberry are nominated for lead actor and actress, and Tucker and Bartlett for supporting actor and actress.

Tim Reid and his wife, Daphne Maxwell Reid, are in the new CBS show "Frank's Place." He plays a professor who inherits a New Orleans Creole restaurant, and she's a funeral home embalmer who is his love interest. They also were a romantic duo on Reid's former series, "Simon & Simon."

Ken Olin and his wife, Patricia Wettig, are married on ABC's "Thirtysomething" — but not to each other. The show is about baby boomers grown up with their own babies. Olin and Mel Harris play Michael and Hope, a young couple struggling with their first child. Wettig and Tim Busfield play Nancy and Elliott, their longer-married friends.

There are two married couples on CBS' "Designing Women," though the husbands aren't regulars. Hall

Holbrook appears occasionally as love interest opposite his wife, Dixie Carter, and Richard Gilliland, who recently wed co-star Jean Smart, appears as Annie Potts' boyfriend.

Wendy Phillips' real-life husband Scott Paulin plays her husband on "Year in the Life," but only in the first episode. Their characters split up and Paulin leaves the series.

Married couples working together have been around since the beginning of the medium. Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz made television history with "I Love Lucy."

Other wedded pioneers were Ozzie and Harriet Nelson ("The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet"), Roy Rogers and Dale Evans, George Burns and Gracie Allen, Jack Benny and Mary Livingston, Ernie Kovacs and Edie Adams, Howard Duff and Ida Lupino ("Mr. Adams and Eve"), Ronald Colman and Benita Hume ("The Halls of Ivy"), Goodman and Jane Ace ("Easy Aces") and Ann Jeffreys and Robert Sterling ("Topper").

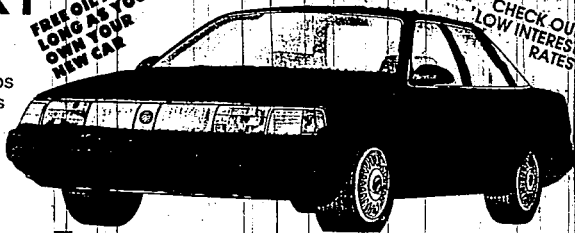
