# Pioneer jeweler dies at age 106

TWIN FALLS — He was the grand old man of wildlife conservation in southern Idaho.

Waiter R. Priebe, who died Thursday at age 106, slao was Twin Falls oldeat resident and a pioneer jeweler, coming here in 1908 when the town was in its infancy.

Housing was so scarce he first slept in the aisle of his store since the town's only hotel, the Ferrine, had guests sleeping in the lobby. In a Times-News interview with O.A. Gus' Kelker in 1973, Priebe recalled the dust was so deep on Twin Falls streets he kept a damp cloth handy to wipe off his showcase.

"After a good rain, we had to use

showsse.

"After a good rain, we had to use the coal shovel to ecop out the mud the customers would bring in on the bare floor," Priebe said.

Les Hazen, former president of the Twin Falls Wildlife Federation, described Priebe as 'the first constitution of Jahob 'who 'did a lot of things so that sportsmen today pan continue to fish and hunt."

Priebe helped organize sportsmen associations on local, state and national levels and was involved in the initiative which created the lidaho Fish and Game Department. His action to form the town's first sportsmen's club, known for many years as the Southern Idaho Fish and Game Association, now the Twin Falls Wildlife Federation, was typical of his concern for wildlife conservation. Priebe's indignation was aroused the fall of 1809 when he and a hunting companion found three sacks of old, decomposed sagchens on the Salmon Butte. We were so mad we came home and the next day gave out word up and down Main Street we were calling a meeting to organize a sportsmen's club, 'Priebe related in a Times News Magic Valley Portrait in 1958.

Reagan picks conservative

WASHINGTON — President Reagan, making good on his promise to pick another hardline conservative, nominated federal appeals court Judge Douglas H. Ginsburg to the Supreme Court on Thursday, risking a second confirmation battle in the Senate.

Reagan praised Ginsburg as an advocate of judicial restraint and a believer in law and order. He said Ginsburg "will take a tough, cleareyed view" of the Constitution "while remaining sensitive to the safety of our citizens and to the problems facing law enforcement professionals."

Ginsburg sits on the Washington. Ginsburg and Bork are generally viewed as being ideologically similar. And they both sport beards, If confirmed, Ginsburg would be one of the youngest justices ever to sit on the court. He is 41. A former Harvard Law School professor and head of the Justice Department anti-trust division, he also would be the first Jew to sit on the high court since the resignation of Abe Fortas in 1969.

Seeking to head off the lengthy debate that led to Bork's defeat, Reagan said, "If these hearings take more than three weeks to get going, the American people will know what's up."


But opposition was forming. Sen.

Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., a leader of the fight against Bork, said he was concerned that Attorney General Edwin Meese III prevailed on Reagan "to name an ideological clone of Judge Bork — a Judge Bork without a paper trail — instead of a real conservative who would have broad support in the Senate."

Ginsburg was reported to have been Meese's choice while White House chief of staff Howard H. Baker Jr. was urging the appointment of federal appeals court judge Anthony Kennedy of Sacramento, Calif., who would have been a less controversial choice.

On Monday, Baker sounded out five key-Republican senators about 13 or 14 potential nominees and, according to Republican sources, half of these named drew at least some

# Demo tax hike wins in House

WASHINGTON — The House on Thursday reversed itself and passed a \$12 billion tax increase and other parts of a Democratic deficit-reduction bill, ignoring protests that such action could scuttle bipartisan negotiations with the White House.

The 206:205 final vote came less than eight hours after the House had refused to even consider the package.

The bill was approved after Speaker Jim Wright, D-Texas, and other Democratic leaders yielded to demands and stripped from the package an unrelated measure overhauling the welfare system. That was sufficient to bring back into the fold enough conservative Democrate to reverse the embarrassing defeat for the leadership.

Passage of the bill, said Rep. Jim Slattery, D-Kan., would show a doubting public that "we are capable of making some tough declaions. He criticized colleagues who attacked the package on grounds it was incomplete. "It's a darn good first step toward a solution," Slattery said.

The House bill is likely to serve as a basis for the negotiations between Congress and the Reagan administration on a plan for slash the deficit.

MOSCOW — A Soviet Foreign Ministry spokesman said Thursday that the United States and the So-viet Union have agreed on the terms of a summit meeting to take place before the end of the year.

He played in the Twin Falls Municipal band from 1903 until about 1917 and worked on liberty loan drives during World War I.

In 1980 he was honored as one of the fathers of the Year in conjunction with Twin Falls The naniversary celebration.



# U.S. must restrict fiscal policy as first step toward stability

The record stock market crash a week age Monday, a jarring experience for financial market participants, was, more than anything, a reflection of the frustration of global investors over a confused U.S. economic policy.

market patteriation, was, and anything, a reflection of the frustration of global investors over a confused U.S. economic policy.

If this policy is not promptly altered to address the ongoing problem of the U.S. budget deficit, the frustration felt by those in the financial markets soon will spread to the population at large as interest rates rise and as recession sets in.

The plain fact is that under the Louvre accord, where the dollar is perged to its present level-in order to maintain currency stability, the U.S. trade gap cannot narrow appreciably unless the budget deficit is reduced significantly. True, the dollar has depreciated against many of the currencies of its major trading partners to a level that is about 10 percent above its average during the late 1970s, when the U.S. trade shortfall was much smaller. But it has not fallen enough to curb the American appetite for imports and to restore balance in the trade account.

The reason is that since 1980 domestic demand has grown much faster in the United States than abroad, as a result of the unprecedented divergence between U.S. fiscal policies and those of this country's major rading partners in the first half of the 1980s. The extraordinary fiscal estimulus involveness and produced a 23 percent surge in the real volume of spending in the United

States, almost twice as great as the average increase of 13 percent abroad. This dispartify in domestic spending levels led to a substantial rise in import demand in the United States, which has not been matched by a similar pickup in expenditures of foreign buyers of American products.

Consequently, pegging the dollar at its current value, given the disparity in spending levels, means that U.S. interest rates must remain substantially above those of Germany and Japan as the United States attempts to attract foreign capital to finance its outsized trade deficit. Any upward movement in rates in either of these countries, such as the moderate increase in German short-term interest rates earlier this month, must be matched by similar increases in U.S. rates. Indeed, the pegging of the dollar had effectively turned U.S. monetary policy over to the Germans, whose commitment to low inflation and concern over fast money growth almost guarantee further increases in interest rates.

Moreover, the longer the trade deficit remains large, the more dependent the U.S.

over, the longer the trade deficit remains large, the more dependent the U.S. becomes on foreign capital inflows, This, in turn, implies that the gap between rates in the United States and those in Germany i States and those in Germany must widen further if the dollar and Japan must widen further if the dis to be stabilized. Pegging the dollar wout a simultaneous tightening of fiscal

policy, therefore, implies high and rising unterest rates.

Reinforcing this tendency for such rate hikes is increased volatility in financial markets, which raises the risk premium in interest rates that investors must be awarded. In general, when one price is pegged, other prices must bear the full burden of the adjustment to changing market conditions that normally is shared by all prices. In our case, the pegging of the foreign exchange value of the dollar has produced a substantial increase in the volatility of interest rates and, of course, in atock prices. More volatility is likely in the coming weeks if the dollar remains pegged and if no actions are taken to reduce the U.S. budget deficit.

Thus, given the disparity in domestic demand between the United States and countries abroad, the current value of the dollar is unable to narrow the trade gap. U. S. economic policy, therefore, must be fundamentally altered if we are to avoid rising interest rates, dangerously high levels of volatility in financial markets and recession.

This could be accomplished by the United States adopting, which would curb consumer demand, or by foreign countries' implementing more stimulative measures, thus increasing local policy, which would curb consumer demand, or by foreign countries' implementing more stimulative measures, thus increasing local spending. But in this case, it is the United States that must take the first step.

It is of the highest order of importance that the president and Congress make an irrevocable commitment to do whatever neces any — whether this is higher taxes, re-

duced government spending or both — to shrink the budget deficit. This commitment could then be presented to the Germans in exchange for something that they have been numilling to give without a quid pro quo—that is, a more growth-oriented economic policy. As the disparity in domestic demand is reduced, U.S. interest rates would fall in the process, and the dollar would stabilize without having to be pegged by the authorities.

# Catastrophic health insurance plan fails to adjust to income

Catastrophic health insurance for the redired is a good idea if its cost can be kept under control.

Unfortunately, the proposal now being negotiated between the administration and Congress to incorporate catastrophic insurance into Mediciare would lead to runsway costs. Time spent redesigning this legislation could have far greater fiscal implications in the next few decades than trying to inne-tune the Gramm-Rudman-Hollings budget reductions for 1988.

It's hard to disagree with the idea of catastrophic health insurance, particularly for the elderly. As people live longer they face a greater likelihood of incurring massive Jundical costs. It is tragic when a couple's lifetime savings for retirement disappear because of a single illness. And although private insurance for catastrophic illness is Lavailable, there are many who fail to provide for themselves and are forced to use up their savings and turn to Medicaid.

of such insurance should be to limit out-ofpocket health expenses for any individual
cor couple to an amount that the individual
are afford to pay without undue financial
hardship. The lower the individual's income
or assets, the less he or she should be expected to pay out of pocket before the catastrophic insurance takes over.
Unfortunately, neither the administration's plan nor the legislation introduced in
Congress inks benefits to true out-of-pocket
expenses or to ability to pay. Instead, these
proposals would initiate benefits at the
same expenditure level for all Medicare
beneficiaries regardless of their income,
thus ignoring the fact that what is a catastrophic expense for some of the nation's
aged is easily paid for by others. The administration plan would pravide catastrophic
benefits after a deductible of \$2,000 of hospital costs, while the Senate plan would re-

duce this threshold expenditure to \$1,850. An even more remarkable shortcoming of the current proposals is that they would not actually require any out-of-pocket expenditure but would trigger the catastrophic benefite even if private insurance paid the entire deductible. A plan that should be designed to prevent financial hardship would end up paying billions of dollars to individuals who have not had any out-of-pocket-expenses.

Puture retirees will, in the normal course of events, have higher pension incomes and Social Security benefits and will therefore be able to afford higher real levels of health care spending than today's senior citizens. So even if the same level of the catastrophic deductible is applied to every Medicare beneficiary at each point in time, that level should be raised over the years in line with the increased ability to pay. Again, neither headministration plan nor the congressional proposal would do so.

This fallure to adjust the catastrophic protection to rises in income over time could lead to akyroketing costs in the years along the sound be read to a story control of the control of the sound lead to akyroketing costs in the years a head. Hospital costs increase substantially faster than the general level of consumer

prices. Adjusting the threshold level of expenditure only for the general rise in consumer prices but with no allowance for the rise in real incomes, as the House and Senate plans propose, would cause the number of individuals qualifying for catastrophic benefits to rise rapidly in the future. Thus the Medicare actuaries estimate that the fraction of Medicare beneficiaries who qualify for catastrophic benefits would rise from 10 percent in 1990 to 30 percent two decades later.

Here the administration proposal is superior to the House and Senate versions. Although the administration's plan would not explicitly relate the catastrophic deductible to increasing incomes, it would achieve a similar effect by linking the catastrophic deductible to increase in medical-care costs. The actuaries estimate that, with this adjustment, the fraction of Medicare beneficiaries who receive catastrophic benefits would remain constant at about 10 percent.

The difference in the future adjustment of

The difference in the future adjustment of the catastrophic deductible implies dramatic differences in the overall cost of the plan. Although both plans start off with rela-

tively small costs, after 20 years the administration plan is projected to cost a hefty \$68 billion a year and the Senate plan more than twice as much. Even after adjusting for inflation, the difference in those projected annual costs between the administration plan and the Senate version exceeds this year's entire \$23 billion Gramm-Budman-Hollings deficit-reduction goal.

If the politics of 1987 make this the year or enacting catastrophic health insurance for the sged, Congress should take seriously the task of targeting the benefits properly. Catastrophic protection should be based on out-of-pocket expenses, not on the bills paid by some insurance company. Senior citizens with lower income should have be pay less out of pocket than those with higher incomes. And the level of the catastrophic deductible should be scheduled to rise over time with the incomes of the aged or the level of medical-care costs in order to keep the benefits focused on those with unusually high expenses.

# U.S. must restrict fiscal policy as first step toward stability

Monday, a jarring experience for financial market participants, was, more than anything, a reflection of the frustration of global investors over a confused U.S. economic coliev.

anything, a reflection of the frustration of global investors over a confused U.S. economic policy.

If this policy is not promptly altered to address the ongoing problem of the U.S. budget deficit, the frustration felt by those in the financial markets soon will spread to the population at large as interest rates rise and as recession sets in.

The plain fact is that under the Louvre accord, where the dollar is pegged to its present level in order to maintain currency stability, the U.S. trade gap cannot narrow appreciably unless the budget deficit is reduced significantly. True, the dollar has depreciated against many of the currencies of its major trading partners to a level that is about 10 percent above it a verage during the late 1970s, when the U.S. trade shortfall was much smaller. But it has not fallen enough to curb the American appetite for imports and to restore balance in the trade account.

for imports and to restore balance in the trade account.

The reason is that since 1980 domestic demand has grown much faster in the United States than abroad, as a result of the unprecedented divergence between U.S. fiscal policies and those of this country's major trading partners in the first half of the 1980s. The extraordinary fiscal stimulus introduced in the United States during this period, in contrast with fiscal restraint overseas, produced a 23 percent surge in the real volume of spending in the United

States, almost twice as great as the average increase of 13 percent abroad. This disparity in domestic spending levels led to a substantial rise in import demand in the United States, which has not been matched by a similar pickup in expenditures of foreign buyers of American products.

Consequently, pegging the dollar at its current value, given the disparity in spending levels, means that U.S. interest rates must remain substantially above those of Germany and Japan as the United States attempts to attract foreign capital to finance its outsized trade deficit. Any upward movement in rates in either of these countries, such as the moderate increase in German short-term interest rates earlier this month, must be matched by similar increases in U. S. rates. Indeed, the pegging of the dollar had effectively turned U.S. of the dollar had effectively turned U.S. of the dollar had effectively turned U.S. of the countries in the state of the countries of the countrie

in interest rates.

Moreover, the longer the trade deficit remains large, the more dependent the U.S. becomes on foreign capital inflows. This, in turn, implies that the gap between rates in the United States and those in Germany and Japan must widen further if the dollar and Japan must widen further it the dollar is to be stabilized. Pegging the dollar with-out a simultaneous tightening of fiscal

policy, therefore, implies high and rising interest rates.

Reinforcing this tendency for such rate hikes is increased volatility in financial markets, which raises the risk premium in interest rates that investors must be awarded. In general, when one price is pegged, other prices must bear the full burden of the adjustment to changing market conditions that normally is shared by all prices. In our case, the pegging of the foreign exchange value of the dollar has produced a substantial increase in the volatility of interest rates and, of course, in stock prices. More volatility is likely in the coming weeks if the dollar remains pegged and if no actions are taken to reduce the U.S. budget deficit.

Thus, given the disparity in domestic demand between the United States and countries abroad, the current value of the dollar is unable to narrow the trade gap. U. S. economic policy, therefore, must be fundamentally altered if we are to avoid rising interest rates, dangerously high levels of volatility in financial markets and recession.

This could be accomplished by the United States' adopting a more restrictive fiscal policy, which would curb consumer demand, or by foreign countries' implementing more stimulative measures, thus increasing local spending. But in this case, it is the United States that must take the first step.

It is of the highest order of importance that the president and Congress make an irrevocable commitment to do whatever necessary — whether this is higher taxes, re-

duced government spending or both — to shrink the budget deficit. This commitment could then be presented to the Germans in exchange for something that they have been unwilling to give without a quid pro quo—that is, a more growth-oriented economic policy. As the disparity in domestic demand is reduced, U.S. interest rates would fall in the process, and the dollar would stabilize without having to be pegged by the authorities.

# Catastrophic health insurance plan fails to adjust to income

Catastrophic health insurance rower itered is a good idea if its cost can be kept under control.

Unfortunately, the proposal now being negotiated between the administration and Congress to incorporate catastrophic insurance into Medicare would lead to runsway roosts. Time spent redesigning this flegislation could have far greater facal impliestion outled have far greater facal implies budget reductions for 1988.

It's hard to disagree with the idea of catastrophic health insurance, particularly for the elderly. As people live longer they face a greater likelihood of incurring massive medical costs. It is tragic when a couple's lifetime savings for retirement disappear because of a single illness. And although private insurance for catastrophic illness is available, there are many who fail to provide for themselves and are forced to use up their savings and turn to Medicaid.

A well-designed catastrophic health nusurance within Medicare could protect the aged from the financial crisis of bankrupting medical costs without permitting program and the savings are out of centrel. The basic goal

of such insurance should be to limit out-ofpocket health expenses for any individual
or couple) to an amount that the individual
can afford to pay without undue financial
hardship. The lower the institution income
or ussets, the less he or she should be expected to pay out of pocket before the catastrophic insurance takes over.
Unfortunately, neither the administration's plan nor the legislation introduced in
Congress links benefits to true out-of-pocket
expenses or to ability to pay. Instead, these
proposals would initiate benefits at the
same expenditure level for all Medicare
beneficiaries regardless of their income,
thus ignoring the fact that what is a catastrophic expense for some of the nation's
aged is easily paid for by others. The administration plan would profite catastrophic
benefits after a deductible of \$2,000 of hospital costs, while the Senate plan would re-

duce this threshold expenditure to \$1,850. An even more remarkable shortcoming of the current proposals is that they would not actually require any out-of-pocket expenditure but would trigger the estastrophic benefits even if private insurance paid the entire deductible. A plan that should be designed to prevent-lineacie hardship-would—signed to prevent-fineacie hardship-would—als who have not had any out-of-pocket expenses.

expenses.

Future retirees will, in the normal course of events, have higher pension incomes and Future retirees will, in the normal course of events, have higher peneion incomes and Social Security benefits and will therefore be able to afford higher real levels of health care spending than today's senior citizens. So even if the same level of the catastrophic deductible is applied to every Medicare beneficiary at each point in time, that level should be raised over the years in line with the increased ability to pay. Again, neither the administration plan nor the congressional proposal would do so.

This failure to adjust the catastrophic protection to rises in income over time could lead to skyroketing costs in the years

lead to skyrocketing costs in the years ahead. Hospital costs increase substantic faster than the general level of consumer ntially

prices. Adjusting the threshold level of ex-penditure only for the general rise in con-sumer prices but with no allowance for the rise in real incomes, as the House and Sen-

sumer prices but with no allowance for the rise in real incomes, as the House and Senate plans propose, would cause the number of individuals qualifying for catastrophic benefits to rise rapidly in the future. Thus the Medicare actuaries estimate that the fraction of Medicare beneficiaries who qualify for catastrophic benefits would rise from 10 percent in 1990 to 30 percent two decades later.

Here the administration proposal is superior to the House and Senate versions. Although the administration's plan would not explicitly relate the catastrophic deductible to increasing incomes, it would achieve a similar effect by linking the catastrophic deductible to increase in medical-care costs. The actuaries estimate that, with this adjustment, the fraction of Medicare beneficiaries who receive catastrophic benefits would remain constant at about 10 percent.

tively small costs, after 20 years the administration plan is projected to cost a hefty \$68 billion a year and the Senate plan more than twice as much. Even after adjusting for inflation, the difference in those projected annual costs between the administration plan and the Senate version exceeds this year's entire \$23 billion Gramm-Rudman-Hollings deflict-reduction goal.

If the politics of 1987 make this the year for enacting catastrophic health insurance for the aged, Congress should take seriously the task of targeting the benefits properly. Catastrophic protection should be based on out-of-pocket expenses, not on the bills paid by some insurance company. Senior citizens with lower incomes should have to pay less out of pocket than those with higher incomes. And the level of the eathstrophic deductible should be scheduled to rise over time with the incomes of the aged or the level of medical-care costs in order to keep—the benefits focused on those with unusually high expenses. the benefits focuses ally high expenses.

# Panel OKs \$597 billion spending bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Appropriations Committee on Thursday approved a 5597 bil-jion catchall spending package to fi-nance operation of the government through fiscal year 1988, wrapping together 13 separate money bills into the largest appropriation mea-sure ever. sure ever.

The committee sent the measure to the House floor by voice vote. But anticipating lengthy wrangling with the Senate and White House before final enactment, it also passed a temporary spending bill to keep the government operating through Nov. 20, extending an existing temporary measure by 10 days.

The \$597 billion bill would fi-nance virtually all of the govern-nent's regular operations, from de-ense to child nutrition programs, alnance virtually all of the govern-ment's regular operations, from de-fense to child nutrition programs, al-though some entitlements which au-though some entitlements which au-tomatically continue are not in-cluded in the measure. The total fed-eral budget for fiscal 1988 exceeds \$1 trillion.

Since fiscal 1988 began Oct. 1, government agencies have been operating at last year's levels under a temporary spending measure which expires Nov. 10.

which expires Nov. 10.

By voice vote, the committee approved a bill extending that temporary spending measure until Nov.

20. The bill would also extend language in the earlier bill which provides about \$\$90,000 a day in non-weapons aid to the Contra rebels in Nicaragua.







Existing dam safety rules focus on spillway capacity. Young said the new requirement will be based on "probable maximum flood," which might be even greater than the traditional "100-year flood." Among the rules is a section giving the DWR director the right to reject defective material and work, manship in new dams.

One of the rules the canal companies want changed defines alterations or repairs as work that may directly affect the safety of the dam or reservoir as determined by the DWR director.

The canal companies, through the Idaho Water Users Association, call the rule "vague and ambiguous." They call on the state to allow repair and modification of dams up to existing design without having to submit the plans and specifications for state review.

The rules call for owners of large dams to evaluate the ability of their structures to withstand carthquakes. The rule applies to affects both the Milner and Murtaugh dams. Milner provides water for the North Side and Twin Falls canal companies and Murtaugh provides water for Twin Falls canal.

At Milner, the dam face is to be strengthened and dam gates replaced as part of a \$7 million immurement. Program as as Jack

provement program, says Jack Eakin, manager, Twin Falls Cana

If the new rules are approved, Twin Falls canal will have to do a study on whether the Milner spillway is adequate to handle flooding, he says.

Twin Falls canal has already done a seismic study on Milner as required by the new rules, Eakin says. This information will be incorporated into the Milner improvement project, he says.

A new spillway was put in at Murtaugh Dam in 1984 as well as a new outlet in 1983. Eakin says." I think the spillway will be adequate but we will have to do another study," he says.

Under the new rules, Milner is classified as a high risk dam because if it failed, it could inundate with more than two feet of water at a velocity of more than two feet personal. Such a flood would damage crops, agriculture and industrial facilities, transportation and other public facilities, the state says.

The new rules and regulations would affect Milner, Murtaugh and other non-federal dams in other ways. They would also cover construction of new dams.

Among the chadges is a requirement that big, new dams in high-hazard areas must include the capability of stopping or lessening down stream flooding. Norm Young, DWR administrator, said.



Dear Mr. Wolff:
If partner opens one club and rebids
two no-trump after my one-spade
response, how many HCP does he
promise?

ANSWER: Those who use a range of 16-18 HCP to open one no-trump promise 19-20 HCP. Those whose range is lower (15-17 HCP) promise 18-20 HCP.

If I double one club for takeout and partner jumps. his response to two spades, is his jump a forcing bid?

Nodged, Lakerood, Calif.

ANSWER: A jump response to a takeout double is highly invitational but not forcing. It shows an invitational hand (9-11 points) and invites tional nand (9-11 points) and invites doubler to proceed unless he has a minimum takeout double. Since a non-jump response shows 0-8 points, the jump is an attempt to differentiate between hands of these ranges.

Dear Mr. Wolff:

ANSWER: "A lead or play made si-multaneously with another player's

legal lead or play is deemed to be subsequent to it." The card illegally led must be played on that trick if it is of the same suit (or if that player cannot follow suit). If it is of another suit and that player can follow suit, the illegally led card becomes an exposed card. (Declarer cannot have an exposed card.)

Dear Mr. Wolff: We have trouble with cuts. How deep can a cut go? Is it OK to cut to within a card or two from the bottom? Bottoms Up, Indian River, Mich.

ANSWER: After the cut, each pile must contain at least four cards. If

the cut is any deeper than that (or more shallow), a re-cut is stip-ulated.







In Milos Forman's lavishly filmed version of "Amadeus," significantly rewritten by Shaffer, Mozart himself takes center stage and what was a tightly coiled, operatic dance of death has spread out into a sumptuous musical epic that is at once an old-time biography, a love story, a drama of revenge and the story of a young musical rebel felled in his prime.

# 'Dirty Dancing' offers viewers a smart, sensual musical film

DIRTY DANCING (PG-13).
Smart and funny, touching and unabashedly sensual, this musical loys story set in the Catakills in the early '60s is the sweet sleeper of a hot season. Because director Emile hot season. 




