## Budget deficit negotiators moving forward

WASHINGTON — Participants in the budget deficit-reduction negotiations traded Republican and Democratic proposals Thursday and said they were plowing ahead, but House Speaker Jim Wright said Democrats couldn't count on success in the talks between the Reagan administration and Congress.

Sen. Pat Domenici of New Mexico, senior Republican on the Senate Budget Committee, put forward a proposal for compromise and said the talks seemed to be moving along in a full day of meetings.

"I have to be happier than I was. We're kicking around new ideas at least, and that's worthwhile," he told reporters after one of the closed-door bargaining sessions. "I'm not confident, but I'm hopeful," said White House Chief of Staff Howard Baker, who said any pessimism at this stage was unjustified.

Rep. Silvio Conte, R-Mass., who was pessimistic early but more optimistic later in the day, said the meeting got heated.

"We're no longer shadow-boxing," said Conte, the senior GOP member of the House Appropriations Committee, adding: "We're moving forward and there is a good

chance we can get an agreement." President Reagan planned to meet this morning with the GOP leadership. Republican lawmakers said they planned to give Reagan their view of the talks and see in what areas he might be willing to move toward compromise.

Domenici's plan, according to sources who spoke on the condition of anonymity, was designed to reduce the deficit by about \$30 billion in fiscal 1988, the current budget year which opened Oct. 1, and about \$45 billion in fiscal 1989. It included about \$11 billion in tax increases, including some increased enforcement by the Internal Revenue

Service.

It also would restrict entitlement programs and domestic spending, while calling for selling some government assets and refinancing some loans to raise additional money.

Sen. Lawton Chiles, D-Fla., chairman of the Senate Budget Committee, responded to

Domenici's offer with a revised version of a plan he offered earlier, lawmakers said. Democratic negotiators were still pushing for more restraint on military spending and more taxes, instead of the deeper domestic cuts in the GOP proposals, said sources familiar with the talks.

Meanwhile, Sen. Frank H. Murkowski, R-Alaska, announced that he would introduce a bill on Friday to skip all cost-of-living raises for federal employees, pensioners and other beneficiaries — including Social Security. That plan would cut about \$12 billion from anticipated federal spending in fiscal 1988.

President Reagan and Democratic leaders have both said Social Security cuts will not be considered, but sources said the issue still arises during the deficit reduction talks. Participants speaking privately said they doubted the program would be touched.



## Ginsburg admits pot use

WASHINGTON — Supreme Court nominee Douglas H. Ginsburg admitted Thursday that he used marijuana once in the 1960s and on a few occasions in the 1970s and said, "It was a mistake and I regret it."

President Reagan and Attorney General Edwin Meese III immediately pledged their continued support for Ginsburg, but Senate Republican Leader Bob Dole issued a statement that neither supported nor opposed his appointment.

Ginsburg issued his statement after National Public Radio asked for comment on its interviews with individuals he had used marijuana while teaching at Harvard Law School and had, on at least one occasion, brought the substance to a gathering. NPR later said a source close to Ginsburg called to deny that he had brought the substance to a party.

"Earlier today, I was asked whether I had ever used drugs. To the best of my recollection, once as a college student in the '60s, and then on a few occasions in the '70s, I used marijuana," Ginsburg said. "That was the only drug I ever used. I have not used it since. It was a mistake, and I regret it."

While many Republicans responded cautiously, Sen. Charles Grassley, R-Iowa, a member of the Senate Judiciary Committee, said, "You like to talk people who are appointed to the Supreme Court respect the law."

"If it was known before he was nominated, it would not have been nominated," said Sen. James McClure, R-Idaho. "It certainly makes it more difficult."

The development plunged the 41-year-old Ginsburg into fresh controversy that had the potential to derail or at least complicate his confirmation to the Supreme Court.

Roagan's previous attempt to fill the seat of retired Justice Lewis Powell Jr. ended in defeat when Ginsburg's appeals court colleague Robert H. Bork was rejected, 68-42.

Senate Republicans reacted with caution. Senate Democratic Leader Robert C. Byrd of West Virginia had no immediate comment, and Judiciary Committee Chairman Joseph

# Shippers fear worst if UP freight offices close

TWIN FALLS — Some of Union Pacific Railroad's biggest Idaho customers say they are experiencing poor service during a crucial shipping period and they fear the situation will get worse if UP's plan to close local freight offices is approved by the state Public Utilities Commission.

The PUC will hear testimony on the proposed closures of the freight office in Pocatello on Dec. 2 and some of the customers, including Jim Mack of Amalgamated Sugar, say they plan to attend.

"We're right in the heat of battle. We're having some real problems," says Mack, materials manager of Amalgamated in Ogden, Utah. "The company uses 4,000 to 5,000 railroad cars a year to ship its refined sugar from plants in Twin Falls, Burley, Nampa and Nyssa, Ore.," he says.

UP plans to replace the local agents with a national customer service center in St. Louis linked by a toll-free number. The company concedes it is having problems during

## Railroad, PUC tangle over closure plan

TWIN FALLS — Union Pacific Railroad's plan to close freight offices in Idaho involves a pull and tug with the state Public Utilities Commission at least as far back as 1985.

The railroad says it wants to streamline operations throughout its system as Burlington Northern, its competitor in the West, is doing. Instead of relying on the local freight agent, the railroad is asking

the transition period but thinks it will make some headway in resolving them in three to four months, says Dick Myrner, UP spokesman in Salt Lake City. "The bad situation is magnified at the national customer service center in St. Louis. They're having a hell of a time knowing what goes on at Amalgamated and do they even care?" Mack asks.

customers to arrange their shipments through a national customer service center in St. Louis. When UP said it wanted to close freight offices in Idaho, the PUC said it could close some for a year's trial.

At the end of the trial there was evidence UP didn't give the test a fair shake and the PUC ordered UP to extend the trial for another year, says Gary Richardson, PUC spokesman. That order was issued in January 1987, he said.

Though the local agents are still in place in locales such as Twin Falls and Rupert, UP in some cases is asking customers with problems to use the St. Louis center, says Mack. "We have to have service. The bells won't hold. And we don't have storage for the sugar," he says. "A typical problem involved delayed cars bound from Geneva,

Utah. It nearly forced Amalgamated to close its Nampa plant because of a lack of raw materials."

Shipments of coke left Geneva Oct. 27, 29 and Monday and as of Tuesday afternoon they were sitting in a freight yard in Pocatello, he says. "We were down to a two-day supply of coke at the Nampa plant and

might have to shut down," Mack says. When he checked his computer Wednesday morning, he found the cars made it to Nampa and the crisis was averted, he says.

UP says it appointed 30 new superintendents of transportation services to take care of problems such as late one Mack describes. "They are comparable to the old division superintendents but they have a smaller territory and more authority," says UP's Director Paul Wyatt, Jr., based in Pocatello, is the new superintendent of transportation for southern Idaho, he says. At Mart Grain in Rupert, traffic manager Donna Gillespie says, "We're not happy with service right now. We're having a lot of problems getting cars."

## Idaho student loan default rate about 6%; most eventually pay up

TWIN FALLS — About 6 percent of former Idaho students default on higher education loans secured through the state's guaranteeing agency, although the Student Loan Fund of Idaho reports that two-thirds of those delinquent borrowers eventually pay their loans. This is a far cry from the 20 percent default rate that U.S. Secretary of Education William Bennett said Wednesday all schools must meet to avoid losing all federal student aid programs.

But uncertainty remains about the target of Bennett's threats and whether they apply to Idaho colleges and universities. Executive Director Carrol Lee

Lawhorn of SLFI, the state-appointed agency guaranteeing student loans from private banks within Idaho, agrees with school financial aid directors that responsibility for loan collection rests with collection agencies and lending institutions — not schools.

Lawhorn said SLFI, based in Fruitland, handles about \$20 million in loans annually for about 10,000 students, for an average loan of \$2,000. He said former Gov. John Evans appointed the private, non-profit corporation in June 1978 to guarantee student loans so the state wouldn't have to take on that responsibility.

Financial aid directors said the federal government hasn't notified them about default rates. David Perkins, financial aid di-

rector for the College of Southern Idaho, said about 60 percent, or 1,200 of 2,000 students seeking degrees, take out guaranteed loans. But when asked for a default rate for former CSI students, Perkins said, "I don't have any idea."

Perkins and Boise State University's Lois Kelly, director of financial aid, each said that while SLFI guarantees most loans at their schools, each out-of-state guaranteeing agency has different default rates. Perkins said about 60 percent of CSI student loans are through SLFI.

Perkins and Kelly also said they are unaware of studies tracing defaulting students from multi-state collection agencies to individual states. In addition, Bennett's claim

## Calls for adequate defense funding Weinberger submits resignation

WASHINGTON — Secretary of Defense Caspar W. Weinberger officially submitted his resignation to President Reagan Thursday and issued a warning that adequate funding for a strong national defense must not take a back seat to reduction of the federal budget deficit.

Reagan announced at a White House ceremony that he will nominate national security adviser Frank C. Carlucci to be secretary of defense and will promote Army Lt. Gen. Colin L. Powell, Carlucci's deputy, to replace him. Weinberger will remain in office until his successor is ready to take over.

At a Rose Garden ceremony, Reagan praised Weinberger, his longtime friend, as "the finest secretary of defense in the history of our nation" whose "cool and sure judgment" will be greatly missed.

"Although the 70-year-old Weinberger said that his decision to leave was based on his wife's medical condition, others who know him well said that he resigned only at Jane Weinberger's insistence. "She was after him for months to do this," one Pentagon official said of the secretary's 68-year-old spouse.

His designated successor, Carlucci, has a reputation of a skilled conciliator and is expected to have a better relationship with Congress. Pentagon and White House officials said that they did not anticipate any obstacles in winning Carlucci's confirmation.



# Reagan determined to avoid recession

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Reagan administration expressed determination Thursday to keep the United States out of a recession by fostering "lower interest rates, fueling speculation that the Federal Reserve was preparing to slash a key U.S. interest rate."

The comments, first voiced by Treasury Secretary James Baker and then affirmed by the White House, sent the dollar plunging to record lows on foreign currency exchanges.

Currency dealers said the comments meant the administration was willing to face the inflationary risks of a falling dollar in order to stave off an economic downturn during a presidential election year.

Baker, in an interview published Thursday in the Wall Street Journal, said that he wanted to make sure that the Federal Reserve promoted sufficient money growth and falling interest rates in order to prevent an economic downturn triggered by the plunge in stock prices. Baker said he remained optimistic that a downturn could be avoided if policy-makers make the right decisions.

"I think there is some chance that the possibility of recession would have been greater if the stock market had not fallen, he said, contending that the sharp drop in the market had broken an 'inflationary psychology' that had been growing in credit markets.

Interest rates had been climbing in the weeks before the stock market collapse as the Federal Reserve tightened credit conditions in response to fears that a weaker dollar would lead to higher inflation in this country.

But the plunge of the market led to a dramatic turn-about in the Fed's emphasis from fighting inflation to fighting a recession.

The comments from Baker, who has been conferring regularly with Fed Chairman Alan Greenspan on government responses to the market turmoil, were interpreted as signaling that the central bank's easier monetary stance would continue. Economists said it increased the

likelihood that the Fed would lower its discount rate, the interest it charges to make loans to banks, from 6 percent down to 5.5 percent.

Some analysts said the reduction could come as soon as Friday, but other economists said the Fed was likely to wait a few weeks, especially in light of the steep fall in the dollar caused by Baker's comments.

Administration efforts to reduce U.S. interest rates puts downward pressure on the dollar because it means foreign investors earn less of a return on their dollar-denominated assets.

A falling dollar can also raise fears of higher inflation as it drives up the costs of imported products.

## Press conference is vintage 'Cap'

WASHINGTON (AP) — Defense Secretary Caspar W. Weinberger, fresh from a White House farewell ceremony, returned to the Pentagon on Thursday to make a familiar plea to Congress: don't undercut the administration's military buildup because of a misplaced concern over budget deficits.

Appearing at a news conference after finally confirming his plans to resign, Weinberger dismissed suggestions his departure was tied to doubts about a new arms accord with the Soviet Union or any other policy disagreement.

He said he was confident that his replacement, Frank C. Carlucci, would pursue the same goals for which he had fought for almost seven years.

Weinberger also predicted that President Reagan would never use the "Star Wars" missile defense program as a bargaining chip to obtain additional arms accords with the Soviets and said he saw no reason to even worry about additional treaties at this point.

The 70-year-old Weinberger, looking fit and unusually relaxed, joked repeatedly with reporters and made clear he was leaving only because of concerns about his wife's health.

Noting that his wife Jane had undergone cancer surgery, Weinberger said that physicians were convinced "she's completely finished with her cancer."

"She is, however, extremely uncomfortable because of having bro-

ken two or three bones in her back, vertebrae," he added. "She has, for a long time, had this great discomfort and I think that it's time that I do a bit more to fulfill those obligations (to her)."

Asked to reflect on what he considered his greatest setback during his tenure, Weinberger replied: "You are perhaps asking what is my greatest mistake? I'm tempted to say holding this press conference ..."

At another point, he deadpanned that the stock market crash had clearly been caused by "the fact that the defense budget is very low and of course, the news of my resignation."

Much of the news conference was devoted, however, to a vintage Weinberger defense of the Pentagon's budget and an attack on congressional leaders who argue that military spending must be cut to trim the federal deficit.

"For the life of me, I don't see what the reluctance is to voting the amounts that are necessary for the nation's security," Weinberger said.

"We have regained for America what I think was a vitally needed new, renewed military strength. To wash those (gains) all away and let those be eroded because of some fears about a deficit that could be cured easily if the domestic expenditures were cut ... Nothing requires that. We can afford the kind of defense we need ..."

## Byrd urges action on bill over trade legislation

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senate Majority Leader Robert C. Byrd urged lawmakers Thursday to quell jitters over the stock market and act on trade legislation. Elsewhere, agricultural provisions of the bill cleared a key hurdle.

"The worst thing we can do is to be panicked into doing nothing," Byrd said in remarks delivered on the Senate floor amid speculation that stock market fluctuations might have killed many prospects for action on trade.

He acknowledged "voices who say wait, the markets are jittery, the financial markets are unstable, let's not upset them any more."

There are some in the administration who may want to take advantage of the ups and downs of the markets to take the teeth out of the bill or have no bill at all who characterize any action by Congress on trade as

negative, as protectionist," Byrd said.

He said, however, that if "economic times were rosy, if our balance of trade were positive, if the world trading system were fair and expansionist ... what need would there be for a trade bill?"

There would not be any," he said. "If American industry were competitive ... what need would there be for a competitiveness bill?"

As House and Senate Agricultural Committee members met, however, to try to resolve differences between farm trade provisions approved by the two houses, one lawmaker cast new doubt on prospects for trade legislation this year.

"There's a very good chance we won't have a bill," declared Rep. Sam Gibbons, D-Fla., a House Ways and Means Committee member who was visiting the agriculture session.

## Ambassador sympathetic over hostage

NEW YORK (AP) — Iran's U.N. ambassador gave a sympathetic ear Thursday to a delegation seeking the release of Terry Anderson, the American reporter held hostage in Lebanon for more than 2 1/2 years, the leader of a journalists' committee said.

The delegation, which included Dan Rather, anchor of the CBS Evening News, met for about 60 minutes with Ambassador Said Rajaei Khorassani at the Iranian U.N. mission, said David Aikman of Time magazine, a leader of the Journalists' Committee to Free Terry Anderson.

The ambassador was very gracious, and agreed to our request to pass on to Iran 2,000 signatures on an open letter to the Ayatollah Khomeini, Aikman said at a news conference after the meeting.

He said Khorassani said very emphatically that he thought hostagetaking, particularly of innocent hostages, as in this case, was wrong and outrageous.

## Stoppag bill postpones Contra aid

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House approved a stopgap bill Thursday to finance the government through mid-December, postponing an expected showdown on aid to Nicaragua's Contra rebels until the coming administration makes a new \$50 million aid request in about two weeks.

House Speaker Jim Wright, D-Texas, said the short-term spending measure's provision of \$3.2 million in continued non-lethal aid to the Contras was acceptable to Nicaragua's government and would upset the Central American peace process planned to start taking effect Thursday.

House Republican Leader Robert Michel of Illinois said "there's going to be plenty of time for fireworks and hassling" when a longer-term catchall spending measure reaches the floor during the week of Nov. 16. That money legislation would carry the federal government through the fiscal year that will end Sept. 30, 1988.

"We know better than to expect it to be as smooth sailing as this one," Michel said, referring to the short-term spending bill which the House approved by 266-163 after little debate Thursday and sent to the Senate.

This stopgap measure would allow government agencies to continue operating until Dec. 16, at spending levels that had existed during the fiscal year which ended Sept. 30, while the White House and Congress attempt to resolve their disputes on how to reduce the budget deficit.

Michel referred to word that the Reagan administration will ask Congress in two weeks for \$30 million in non-lethal aid for the Contras.

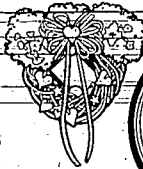

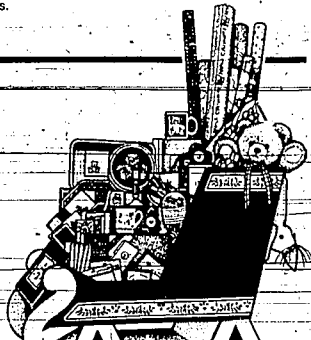

## Managing military spending priority for new defense chief

Caspar W. Weinberger's guiding philosophy over seven years as secretary of defense was the financial well-being of the military establishment, and its corporate clients.

He has consistently sought to maximize the amount of money flowing to the military services and defense contractors, and to minimize external control on how the money is spent. This central thought has illuminated his approach to the full range of issues he has confronted — be it managing the defense budget, committing American troops to combat, or conducting arms control negotiations with the Soviets.

He provided over the greatest peace-time increase in military spending in American history. When the Reagan administration entered office in 1981, the defense budget (adjusted for inflation) stood at about \$200 billion; which has been the normal level since World War II. Today, the budget exceeds \$300 billion, surpassing the \$250 billion annual budget during the wars in Korea and Vietnam.

What have we received for the \$2 trillion defense effort of Mr. Weinberger? This vast increase in the defense budget has had re-

directly counter to Weinberger's established philosophy of letting each service and agency decide its own priorities.

Weinberger's enthusiasm for more money for the military has been accompanied by a reluctance to use the forces at his disposal in actual combat. The major beneficiaries of the Weinberger era were strategic forces, the most expensive and least usable element of our defense establishment. Military forces at the other end of the spectrum, such as those to deal with terrorists, have few needs for expensive hardware, and thus have received less support.

Weinberger has generally counseled restraint in responding to terrorism. And his publicly enunciated criteria for when to commit American troops to a crisis in the Third World are considerable more cautious than the criteria propounded by Secretary of State George P. Shultz. The lesson that Weinberger learned from the Vietnam War is that involving U.S. troops in combat creates political controversy that endangers the military budget.

Weinberger's consistent opposition to arms control has also kept the money

flowing. One of the more attractive aspects of the impending Euromissile agreement is its negligible impact on the defense budget. The weapons to be eliminated are few in number, and have already been paid for.

On the other hand, a treaty limiting strategic forces could lead to annual reductions of tens of billions of dollars in spending on long-range missiles and bombers. Although the "Star Wars" budget seems to have stalled at the \$4 billion level for the foreseeable future, the failure to agree with the Soviets on a compromise on the Strategic Defense Initiative continues to protect the strategic budget from massive reductions.

Weinberger's adamant support for the SDI program must in part be based on a recognition that as long as Star Wars is an obstacle to a treaty reducing strategic offensive forces, the budgets for these forces will be safe.

Thus, Star Wars will shield the budget for America's missiles long before it could defend the missiles themselves.

How will Frank Carlucci, Weinberger's expected successor, fare?

He is unlikely to reverse Weinberger's

course on management of the Department of Defense, and he also seems equally unlikely to change Weinberger's approach to arms control. Earlier this year Carlucci engaged presidential arms control adviser Paul Nitze in a spirited public debate over negotiating with the Soviets on limits on the Star Wars program. Carlucci made it clear at the time that he opposed such negotiations, and there is little reason to believe that he will have a change of heart in his new office in the Pentagon.

The Weinberger-Carlucci approach to the Department of Defense may have worked during an era of public support for rising defense spending. But that public support has dwindled, and the stock market has imposed a reality test for the future. In the future the secretary of defense will have to be more concerned with managing how the military budget is spent, and arms control agreements will be a central part of that process.

"So how did they work out?"

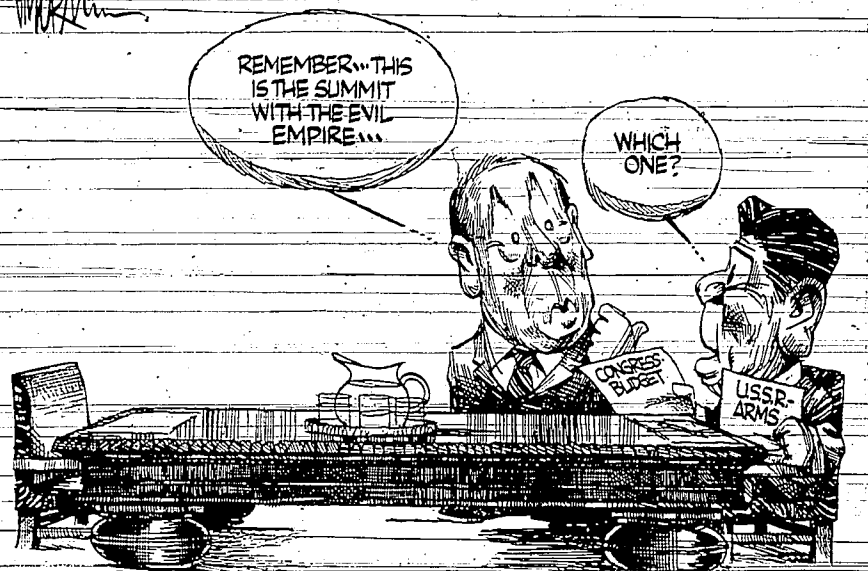
"What?"

I write in hopes you air a problem which involves myself and everyone who pays taxes.

My name is Troy A. Gascon and I am currently incarcerated at the county jail in Jerome for a robbery charge. I received five to 30 years in which I am appealing my case. However, I am waiting in the county jail, awaiting transport to the Boise State Prison.

I have been waiting here for two months and I had a chance to talk to a man involved in the

transportation of prisoners for Blackfoot, Cottonwood and the prison I ask him when I was going and told him my sentence was five to 30 years, thinking that I would be a priority due to the amount of time I have to spend.

Turny and price, he informed me that I was in for a long wait unless the governor does something soon.

The prison is full and the judges hand out time at a fast rate. The prison has an overload of people, some even sleeping on the floor — number of about 100 people. Now I heard about this through a person who was released from Boise.

Now overcrowding at the prison is one problem to look at, but still there is another problem. And that is there are jails in just about every county and in those jails are people waiting for transport.

During the long wait, like myself, I am considered state property. I am in a small-cell with seven other men. Space is very limited, especially for a long period of time.

Not only the fact of no access to exercise space, but I was denied dental or medical treatment, we have to write to the prison for OK. Thus if a body has pain he waits for a state OK before he is treated.

Personally, I would call this a problem. In fact, there is a lot of problems with this type of stocking of state prisoners. The lack of medical and dental help and the lack of exercise is a violation of the Constitution for the reason of cruel and unusual, unfair treatment.

I know that this is an opinion, but it does raise a question as to problem and how legal it is.

I hope you air a story on this for I think the people of Idaho need to know.

## Dwyer gets approval without fanfare

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate on Thursday approved without comment the nomination of liberal Seattle attorney William L. Dwyer, the subject of a former senator's controversial vote trade, to be a U.S. district judge for the Western District of Washington.

The Senate sent the nomination to President Reagan on a voice vote, along with those of four judicial candidates.

The entire process took less than two minutes, even though Dwyer had been the subject of two hearings before the Senate Judiciary Committee, including one session that lasted six hours.

In a report to the Senate, Sen. Patrick Leahy, D-Vt., who conducted the hearings, said, "In my view, William Dwyer is one of the most highly qualified district court nominees to come before the Senate in this or any other year in recent history."

After the Senate confirmation, Sen. Dan Evans, R-Wash., said Dwyer, 38, will bring much moral courage and enlightened wisdom to the bench that all who sit in judgment before him no matter how unpopular — will receive just treatment.

Dwyer's nomination has been the subject of controversy since he was named by President Reagan in March 1986 on the recommendation of Dwyer and former Sen. Slade Gorton, R-Wash. Dwyer had worked with Gorton during Gorton's 12 years as Washington attorney general.

## MIT calls off bidding on supercomputer plan

BOSTON (AP) — Massachusetts Institute of Technology said Thursday it has canceled plans to buy a supercomputer because of U.S. government concerns that Japanese bidders illegally offered to sell at unfairly low prices.

MIT Provost John Deutch said the school reacted "to concerns raised by the Commerce Department, which has accused the Japanese of closing their home market to U.S. supercomputers while 'dumping' their own supercomputers in the United States."

Dumping means selling below fair market value, which is either the cost in the company's home market or the cost of production plus a reasonable markup for profit.

Bidders, in addition to American manufacturers such as International Business Machines Corp., Cray Research Inc. and Control Data Corp., included Honeywell-NEC Supercomputers Inc., a joint venture of Honeywell Inc. and the Japanese computer company NEC Corp., and a joint venture of Amdahl Corp. and the Japanese company Fujitsu Ltd.

## Iran-Contra report to contain surprises

WASHINGTON (AP) — The congressional Iran-Contra committees will provide evidence of high-ranking document-shredding, recommend changes at the CIA and White House, and provide at least a few surprises in their final report, due to be unveiled Nov. 17, panel members said Thursday.

But Republican members—all but three of whom voted against the majority report when it was approved Thursday, mounted a campaign to discredit it in advance, contending it is biased, laced with innuendoes and reaches conclusions not based on evidence.

One GOP lawmaker, Sen. Jesse Helms, R-N.C., urged the Senate to pass a resolution recommending that none of the witnesses interrogated by the committees be indicted unless accused either of perjury or of criminally profiting from their actions.

The Senate rejected that move on a 91-4 tabling motion, despite Helms' argument that "the public good would not be served by flogging a dead horse any further."

"I don't think Oliver North ought to be indicted. I don't think he ought to be pushed around like more," he said, referring to the White House aide who was a key figure in the secret Iranian arms sales and CIA aid to the Nicaraguan Contras.

Sen. Warren Rudman, R-N.H., ranking Republican on the Senate Iran-Contra panel, advised senators to read the report before taking such action.

"There is much in the report that will come as a surprise, even to those who followed the hearings," he said.

Rudman said that while the report accuses no one of violating the law, it does contain evidence that thousands of documents were shredded "not to hide them from the KGB but from the FBI."

"It is not objective; it seeks to prove what I believe were preconceived ideas," said Sen. James McClure, R-Idaho. "The majority report is really a political statement rather than an objective account of what happened."

McClure said: "One of the bones of contention was the suspicion — I might say the frustration — on the part of some who believed the president must have known (of the diversion) but won't admit it."

## Birth control suit could run into billions

RICHMOND, Va. (AP) — A lawyer for women allegedly injured by the Dalkon Shield birth control device said Thursday that settling their claims could cost the A.H. Robins Co. up to \$7 billion, five times what the company estimated.

Robins, while filed for protection from creditors in U.S. Bankruptcy Court in 1985 in the face of mounting claims, places the value of the claims between \$700 million and \$1.2 billion.

It has proposed a \$1.75 billion settlement fund under its Chapter 11 reorganization plan, which includes a merger with the suburban Philadelphia-based Rorer — Group Inc.

At a hearing before U.S. District Judge Robert R. Merhige Jr. and U.S. Bankruptcy Judge Blackwell N. Shelley, who have presided over the Robins case jointly, a lawyer for the Dalkon Shield Claimants' Committee estimated it would take \$4 billion to \$7 billion to settle the claims.

# U.S. marshals capture one of '15 most wanted' in Georgia

ELBERTON, Ga. (AP) — Authorities on Thursday captured convicted bank robber Elton Royce Winchester, one of the U.S. Marshals Service's "15 most wanted" fugitives and on the run for more than seven years.

Winchester, 47, is described by the Marshals Service as "a career criminal" with convictions for bank robbery, burglary, grand larceny, escape and firearms violations. He also is wanted in connection with a slaying in Salinas, Calif., and drug allegations in Florida.

The Marshals Service said it tracked Winchester through 11 states to "northeast Georgia," and Wednesday night called in a surveillance aircraft.

At dawn, a deputy marshal pilot flying over Elberton spotted the car Winchester was believed to be using and directed other marshals and state and local police to the site. Police then surrounded the car and arrested Winchester, the Marshals Service said.

# Experts seek halt to nuclear buildup

WASHINGTON (AP) — A group of arms control experts and nuclear scientists joined in calling Thursday for a two-year suspension of production of plutonium for nuclear weapons.

In an open letter to President Reagan and Congress, they urged negotiations with the Soviet Union to cut off production of plutonium as well as highly enriched uranium.

Dr. Christine Cassel, president-elect of Physicians for Social Responsibility, said a U.S. moratorium would mean not adding 250 nuclear warheads to an arsenal of some 25,000 warheads.

She said at a news conference that plutonium production poses "an unacceptable risk of accidents and contamination."

Former Gov. Russell Peterson of Delaware called nuclear weapons production "probably the most dangerous industrial production in the world."

Peterson, who served on the presidential commission that investigated the Three Mile Island nuclear reactor accident in Pennsylvania, said the Energy Department operates "aged and deteriorating facilities without any outside control."

Other supporters of the drive, called "Plutonium Challenge," included former U.S. arms control negotiators Gerard Smith and Paul Warnke, and William Colby, former director of the Central Intelligence Agency.

A two-year moratorium would forgo some 2,000 pounds of new plutonium — 1 percent of the current stockpile and equivalent roughly to 250 bombs.

Most of the plutonium used for new warheads is obtained from retired warheads. The prospective U.S.-Soviet treaty to scrap intermediate-range nuclear weapons would make up to 4,300 additional pounds available.

Last week, the National Academy of Sciences warned that accidents similar to the Chernobyl disaster near Kiev, in the Soviet Union, could occur at American reactors.

# Biaggi given term, fine

NEW YORK (AP) — Rep. Mario Biaggi, a highly decorated policeman who became a popular 10-term congressman, was sentenced Thursday to 2½ years in jail and fined \$500,000 for accepting free vacations from a political ally.

Biaggi wept as he told the judge that "there's no one in this world more remorseful than myself." But he also said he felt he had done no wrong.

"The only thing wrong that I did, as it developed, was I accepted personal hospitality from an old and dear friend," he said during the 20-minute statement that was at times barely audible in the courtroom.

"If ever there was a Greek tragedy it is this one," said U.S. District Judge Jack B. Weinstein before imposing the sentence. "The hero is today struck low and grief descends."

Biaggi, 70, could have been sentenced to 12 years in jail and fined \$750,000 on his conviction for accepting illegal gratuities, illegally crossing state lines to do so and obstruction of justice.

Biaggi is the senior member of New York City's congressional delegation and was elected repeatedly by overwhelming majorities. He was the most decorated member of the city's police force before setting out on his political career.

Weinstein said Biaggi's crimes were "bred in greed and arrogance."

# Mayor blocks voters, fined

BELLEVILLE, Ill. (AP) — The mayor of Centreville was fined \$300 and placed on court supervision for an Election Day incident in which he was arrested at polling place.

Riley L. Owens III pleaded guilty Wednesday in St. Clair Circuit Court of trying to obstruct a voter.

He had tried to block the door Tuesday at a precinct in Centreville during a demonstration against the election judges.

In exchange for his guilty plea, a felony charge of preventing a person from voting was dismissed, as were charges of resisting arrest and aggravated assault.

# Gunmen kill labor leader's brother; police search campus

**MANILA, Philippines (AP)** — Gunmen fatally shot a labor leader's brother two blocks from the presidential palace Thursday as police were rounding up people accused of being communist rebels on a nearby university campus.

In Angeles City, 50 miles to the north, police detained 10 people in dawn raids as part of an investigation of the killings last week of three Americans and a Filipino near the U.S.-run Clark Air Base. No one has been charged in the killings.

## Sentence suspended for Mbeki

**JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (DPA)** — South Africa Thursday released senior African National Congress resistance fighter Govan Mbeki after 23 years of a life sentence.

Mbeki, 77, was jailed in 1964 along with ANC leader Nelson Mandela and other members of the outlawed black resistance group. He was freed without signing a promise not to become involved in violent activities.

"I am happy in a way that I am back, but I am also concerned for my comrades, especially my co-accused, that I had to leave them behind," Mbeki told newsmen in Port Elizabeth.

"My health is all right," said Mbeki, looking fit in a gray suit. Mbeki, one of five black men sentenced with Mandela to life imprisonment for sabotage in June 1964, said he spent an hour with Mandela at Cape Town's Pollamoor prison.

He said he was confident his comrades would "in due time ... be out like me without any conditions." There was speculation among observers in fact, that South Africa could be testing reaction to Mbeki's release as a trial run to freeing the 70-year-old Mandela.

Mbeki said he still regarded himself as a member of the ANC and the banned Communist Party of South Africa.

Mbeki, arrested at Rivonia near Johannesburg along with other ANC leaders, had been held at the Robben Island political prison near Cape Town.

He was the last of the so-called Rivonia group to be held there. Mandela was moved in 1982 to the main-hand Pollamoor prison.

Mbeki said he would be applying for a passport to visit his eldest son, Thabo, who is an aide to ANC chief Oliver Tambo in Lusaka, Zambia.

Desmond Tutu, the Anglican archbishop of Cape Town who has been a leading campaigner against apartheid, said Mbeki was a hero to the black people.

"He paid a very, very heavy price, and we are very proud of him. We are going to be very happy to open one or two champagne bottles," Tutu said.

Mandela's wife, Winnie, said the release of Mbeki was "a significant step in the history of our struggle."

## Spain's flooding claims 15 lives

**MADRID, Spain (DPA)** — The death toll from severe storms and floods that continue to sweep southeast Spain today is 15 and police, soldiers and civil defense workers were trying to rescue about 2,000 people trapped on the roofs of houses and cars, authorities said Thursday.

The coastal fruit and vegetable-growing region between Valencia and Cartagena has been hit particularly hard by the rains, which have submerged large areas of land under more than 6 feet of water.

Farmers have called on the government to declare the whole region a disaster zone and help bear the cost of losses.

## Rioting breaks out after India's loss

**BOMBAY, India (AP)** — Moslems and Hindus fought Thursday, injuring 31 people, in a battle set off by India's loss in a cricket tournament, an official said.

Police fired in the air to disperse the fighters, who threw gasoline-soaked rags, said the official of the city's Fire Control Room, speaking on condition of anonymity. It was not known if anyone was injured by gunfire.

The battles began when Hindus got angry at Moslem fans of the Pakistani team, who were celebrating India's loss to England in the World Cup tournament.

Rioting was also reported in Ahmedabad in Gujarat state; but there were no injuries.

After Pakistan lost its World Cup cricket bid Wednesday, Hindu celebrations set off clashes in New Delhi.

President Corazon Aquino ordered an investigation of charges that her sister-in-law accepted \$1 million from an Australian businessman in return for gambling concessions.

In another case, the Presidential Commission on Good Government filed corruption charges against Mrs. Aquino's uncle, Rep. Francisco Sumulong. He is majority floor leader in the House of Representatives.

Police said four gunmen ambushed Mario Villar, 40, at about 3:

30 p.m. at a major intersection. Private radio and television stations said he was driving to the palace to pick up his brother Lito, secretary-general of the May 16th Movement, the country's largest militant labor organization.

According to the reports, Lito Villar was making arrangements for a meeting between labor leaders and Mrs. Aquino.

Gunmen shot down the previous May 1st Movement leader, Rolando Olalia, last November. The murder has not been solved.

Thursday's attack occurred in one of Manila's most heavily guarded areas, only a few yards from palace checkpoints, but the killers escaped.

Police said they arrested 24 alleged communist rebels during the second raid this week on the Polytechnic University of the Philippines campus two miles from the murder scene.

Last Sunday, police picked up 99 people on the campus. They released all but two after human rights groups said the detainees

were peasants who fled abuse by anti-communist vigilantes on Leyte Island.

All but one of those arrested Thursday were among the 39 detained in the previous raid, police said.

Brig. Gen. Alfredo Lim, the Manila police chief, said he decided to re-arrest those picked up Sunday because of a military report from Leyta that most were sought in killings or robberies.

Lim said he was considering the arrest of Nemesio Prudente, pre-

sident of the university, on charges of harboring rebels. Those arrested had lived on the campus for months and receiving help from church-based human rights groups.

The rebels have threatened to make target of Americans because of U.S. support for Mrs. Aquino.

American authorities at Clark restricted off-post travel after the killings Oct. 28. U.S. Navy officials imposed similar restrictions at the Subic Bay naval station 50 miles from Manila, but relaxed them Thursday after the arrival of the aircraft carrier USS Midway.

# Group claims Contras' attacks have made them outlaws

MANAGUA, Nicaragua (AP) — A U.S.-based human rights group on Thursday said Contra rebels have carried out attacks on civilians and other acts that have made them an outlaw force.

A 65-page report by Americas Watch also said Sandinista government troops committed "widespread violent abuses" and condemned them for holding prisoners without due process.

The report is titled "Violations of the Laws of War By Both Sides in Nicaragua in 1987." The New York-based group is a critic of the Reagan administration's policies in Central America. The Contras are trained and supported by the United States.

The group has been especially critical in earlier reports of the U.S.-supported government of El Salvador, which is battling Marxist-led guerrillas.

The Americas Watch report said the Contras' abuse of rights meant "we see no way for compliance with the Arias plan's requirements for respect for human rights other than for the dissolution of the Contras and for an end to all aid for them by the United States, Honduras, and all others."

The peace plan put forward by President Oscar Arias of Costa Rica was signed Aug. 7 by the five Central American presidents and intended to end years of civil war in Nicaragua, El Salvador and Guatemala. Its first steps were to take effect Thursday.

The evidence presented in this report indicates that the Contras continue systematically to violate the applicable laws of war, launching indiscriminate attacks in which civilians are killed or often injured, are the victims, targeting for murder Sandinista officials or sympathizers, kidnapping and killing Sandinista combatants after they have been immobilized by

their wounds or surrender," the report said.

Americas Watch also criticized the Contras for attacks on cooperatives, which it said left 21 dead civilians, including 11 children. The rebels maintain that

the coops are military targets because their members are armed.

The report also said the rebels failed to discriminate between civilians and combatants in ambushes, and indiscriminately used land mines and committed kidnapping

and rape. "The Contras have assassinated individuals after stopping their vehicles," it said.

The report mentioned last week's release of American peace activist Paul Fisher kidnapped and held for 18 days by the Contras. He was

working for Witness to Peace, a U.S. group that investigates Contra attacks.

Turning its attention to the Sandinistas, Americas Watch reported its investigations showed three incidents of indiscriminate at-

tacks and two incidents in which "Sandinista soldiers selectively killed civilians."

It also criticized the leftist government for holding prisoners incommunicado, to seek extrajudicial confessions.

## Spain says base pact must end

MADRID, Spain (AP) — Spain told the United States Thursday it will not renew a defense accord that has allowed American troops and military facilities on Spanish soil for 34 years, Foreign Ministry sources said.

The notification came shortly after the start of the seventh round of talks on eliminating part of the American military presence in Spain, said the source, speaking on condition of anonymity.

Spanish negotiators on Thursday gave the U.S. delegation six months' notice of their intent to not renew the agreement, they said.

Juan Lora, Spanish undersecretary for North American affairs, told The Associated Press earlier that Spain intended to present the renunciation notice during the two-day round of talks.

The negotiations began 16 months ago. They have stalled over a Spanish demand that the United States withdraw an Air Force fighter wing of 72 aircraft from Torrejon Air Base outside Madrid.

U.S. negotiators view the Torrejon fighter wing as crucial to Western security, particularly in the defense of NATO's southern European flank.

Lora said Spain's renunciation of the treaty would give the United States until May 1989 to withdraw its 10,000 troops from three air bases, a naval station and nine communication posts.

The United States has maintained forces in Spain since the accord, which is renewable every five years, was first signed by the military government of Francisco Franco in 1953.

The agreement was last signed in 1983. Under its terms, either side must present written notification six months before the expiration date of intentions to renounce or seek changes in the accord. The deadline in this case is Nov. 14.

The Foreign Ministry sources said the first day of the talks, held at the Foreign Ministry, ended at 7 p.m. after 2½ hours. They said both sides agreed not to make public statements about what was discussed.

## Iran, Iraq launch air raids; Iran sees 'no hope' of cease-fire

MANAMA, Bahrain (AP) — Iran and Iraq sent their warplanes to raid each other's territory Thursday, and an Iranian leader said he sees "no hope" that the United Nations can achieve a truce in the 7-year-old war.

At the Pentagon, the Defense Department announced that two reflagged tankers arrived in Kuwait waters, after a trip through the Persian Gulf, with U.S. warships.

Newly arrived American mine sweepers conducted exercises to familiarize themselves with the gulf area, and four British mine-hunting vessels steamed to the central gulf to begin operations off Bahrain.

War communications issued in Baghdad said Iraqi planes attacked the Al-Ahwaz oil field in western Iran on Thursday with "devastating" results.

Tehran radio said Iranian fighter-bombers "inflicted heavy casualties" in raids on military concentrations in Sharhani and Zobeidi, southeast Iraq.

It described the raids as reprisals for Iraqi air attacks Wednesday on "non-military targets" in which civilians were wounded. Iraq denied bombing civilian areas.

Iran did not say how many of its planes participated in the raids Thursday, but it seldom risks more than two or three aircraft at a time because its fleet is small and old, and it suffers a parts shortage. Iraq has about eight times as many planes as Iran.

The radio also said Iranian artillerymen shelled economic and military targets in Iraq's northeastern Sulaymaniyah province, killing or wounding dozens of soldiers and destroying a training garrison and a number of depots and economic installations.

A dispatch from the official Islamic Republic News Agency said 12 Iraqi military helicopters were damaged by the shelling of a base in the same province. Iraq's news agency denied it.

Prime Minister Hussein Muwavi

said "we have no hope that the U.N. can do anything about the war" and Iraq's "extremely critical circumstances" require it to confront the United States in the gulf. He did not elaborate.

Muavi commented to reporters after a meeting of top officials about the gulf situation, according to reports by the official media. Javier Perez de Cuellar, the U.N. secretary-general, is pressing both countries for a truce and a negotiated settlement based on a resolution the Security Council adopted unanimously July 20.

Iran has refused to accept the U.N. plan unless its enemy is declared the aggressor. Iraq invaded Iran in September, 1980, after border skirmishes.

The Reagan administration agreed last summer to reflag and provide Navy escorts to 11 Kuwaiti tankers. Iran accuses Kuwait of aiding Iraq.

The Pentagon said the tankers Chesapeake City and Surf City, accompanied by the guided-missile

frigate Thach, completed their trip through the Persian Gulf without detecting any unusual Iranian surface or air activity.

In a related matter, the Pentagon said it was still investigating whether the Navy frigate Carr had opened fire on an Iranian vessel or a private fishing boat Sunday night. Sources in the region said earlier this week that the Navy fired on an Arab fishing craft, killing an Indian crewman.

The Pentagon insisted Thursday that the Carr had acted properly because of the other boat's failure to heed radio calls and warning shots.

In London, Lloyd's Shipping Intelligence Service said two tankers were wounded Wednesday when an Iraqi warplane rocketed an Iranian supertanker in the third attack on the ship this year. Iraq claimed its planes damaged four vessels Wednesday, but the other attacks were not confirmed independently.

Lloyd's identified the tanker as the 289,779-ton Taftan of the National Iranian Oil Co. It also was hit

Feb. 24 and June 15.

It is one of a fleet Iran uses to shuttle oil from its main Kharg Island export terminal, which is bombed regularly to makeshift facilities 450 miles farther south that are more difficult for Iraqi planes to reach. Iraq has claimed eight strikes on tankers in Iranian waters in 10 days, but the Taftan is the only one confirmed.

## Defector flown to U.S. to face desertion trial

FRANKFURT, West Germany (AP) — Wade Roberts, an American soldier who defected to the Soviet

Union last April, flew Thursday to the United States where he faces charges of desertion, officials said.

Roberts, 22, left the Rhine-Main U.S. Air Force base outside Frankfurt on an Air Force plane headed for Dover Air Force Base in Dover, Del., said Walter Nebgen, spokesman for the 5th Army Corps in Frankfurt. Roberts will go by van to Fort Dix, N.J.

"He's being escorted by representatives from the Frankfurt military community and will be released to the provost marshal's office at Fort Dix upon arrival," said Nebgen.

Nebgen said Roberts' West German girlfriend, Petra Neumann, did not fly to the United States with him.

The Army spokesman said he did not know the exact time of Roberts' departure or when he would arrive at Fort Dix.

Roberts, an army private from Riverside, Calif., spent his first day in the West Thursday undergoing medical examinations at a military hospital.

U.S. military police took Roberts into custody several hours after he arrived in Frankfurt aboard a flight

from Moscow with Ms. Neumann, who is pregnant, military spokesmen said.

Lt. Col. John Dye, spokesman for the Army's 5th Corps, said Roberts did not resist arrest when he was picked up on a Frankfurt street shortly after midnight Thursday. He said Roberts faced desertion charges.

"He hasn't been charged yet, but charges of desertion are being drawn," Dye said.

Roberts, however, said he had been told by U.S. authorities in the Soviet Union that he would be prosecuted for a lesser charge, going absent without leave.

Roberts said he decided to return to the West because he and Ms. Neumann were going to have a child, and he didn't want to go around for the rest of my life having a charge from the United States hanging over my head.

Although he said he was treated "exceptionally well" by the Soviets, Roberts said he did not plan on returning to the Soviet Union and wished to settle in West Germany.

A court martial conviction could result in dishonorable discharge, loss of all pay and privileges and maximum of two years of hard labor, Dye said.

## Fire destroys ballots; could delay election

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — Unannounced fires broke out in a

party printing ballots for this month's national election and set fires that destroyed the presses, its owner said. A member of the Electoral Council said the vote might have to be postponed.

"The violence has caused organizational problems," said council member Carlo Dupin, referring to the fire at Le Natal printing company and another suspicious fire that hit the council's headquarters and destroyed campaign posters, copies of the election law and other material.

When asked whether the nine-member council might postpone the election for president and National Assembly, Dupin replied: "That's a possibility."

Council members, politicians, prominent citizens and foreign diplomats have said the incidents appear to be aimed at derailing Haiti's first election in 30 years.

Supporters of Francois "Papa Doc" Duvalier, who took power in 1957 and those of his son, Jean-Claude Duvalier, who ruled until 21 months ago when he fled to exile in France, are being blamed for the attacks.

## Prince Charles attends military show

MUNICH, West Germany (AP) — Prince Charles of Britain went to a military airport near Munich on Thursday to see a demonstration of the Tornado jet fighter, which is produced jointly by Britain, West Germany and Italy.

The aircraft are assembled at a factory near Manching, 50 miles north of the Bavarian capital. The heir to the British throne, who was trained as a fighter and helicopter pilot, also toured the plant.

Princess Diana visited a children's center in a Munich sub-

urb on the fifth day of the royal couple's week-long visit to West Germany. She was accompanied by Monika Hohlmeier, daughter of Franz Josef Strauss, the Bavarian state governor.

Charles and Diana met in Neuburg, just south of Munich, for lunch at the West German army's training academy.

The prince and princess spent much of the six weeks preceding the trip apart, fueling press speculation they were having marital problems.

## School officials face lawsuit over contract

BOISE — Angeles Eames, who was scheduled to be president of the Wendell Education Association this school year, has filed a \$400,000 lawsuit against school officials, alleging she was not offered a contract this year because of her activity on behalf of the association.

Eames filed the lawsuit in U.S. District Court in Boise, naming as defendants three of the five school board members, the ones who voted not to renew her contract. Also

named as defendant was Superintendent George Crawford.

Crawford declined comment on the lawsuit on Thursday, saying the matter had been turned over to the district's insurance carrier. However, at the time Eames' contract was renewed, he said that her work in the WEA had "absolutely nothing to do" with the loss of her job.

Also named as defendants were board members Jack Hirai, Jim Davis and Elaine Daniels.

Eames said she was employed as a teacher in the 1985-86 and 1986-

87 school years. She served last year on the WEA's negotiating team, the suit said, and she was elected as the association's president for the current school year.

Eames said she was notified in April that she had been placed on probation, and in June, was notified that she would not be rehired.

She alleged school officials told the school board she was a "troublemaker" and "agitator" and that caused the decision not to rehire her.

At a public review in June of the board's decision not to extend her

contract, Elementary School Principal Jerry Hope said Eames had challenged his administrative suggestions with what he perceived to be animosity and anger.

High School Principal Doug Skinner said Eames is bright and capable but "her assertiveness is, at times, inappropriate." He said the teacher needed to develop and use greater tact, sensitivity and diplomacy.

Skinner also said that Eames was given four months' probation but that no "real change" occurred. However, parents and fellow

teachers attending the review asked the board to reconsider its contract decision. They praised Eames' ability to get along with others, including staff members, and said being outspoken is an asset in the teaching profession.

Parent Lana Lamm said Eames was unusually good at making disabled students feel good about themselves and parent Carolyn Dimond said the children in the special education program would be served if Eames continued to teach them.

The lawsuit said Eames has suf-

fered loss of income, emotional distress, embarrassment, humiliation and loss of professional reputation.

It asks \$200,000 for general damages and the same amount for punitive damages. It also asks for a court order that the district remove material from her personnel file that might prove damaging to her professional reputation, and that the district be barred from disclosing that information to others.

Eames took a job as special education teacher in Bliss at the first of the school year.

## Special officers protect courtroom

TWIN FALLS — The new court security program, which requires law enforcement officers be assigned for all court sessions, began this week with the appearance of two special uniformed court officers in the Twin Falls County judicial building.

The first assignment for the newly hired Twin Falls County deputies assigned to courts was to provide security during the Idaho Supreme Court session in Twin Falls.

Sheriff James Munn said Wednesday that two certified law enforcement officers, Patrick Touchette and Wayne Tousley, are now on full-time duty as part of his staff. They will be assigned to security for all court sessions in the judicial building, including trials, preliminary hearings and routine

proceedings in magistrate and district courts and the visiting Supreme Court sessions. "When they are not involved with court duty, they will fill in as regular deputies on patrol duty in this department," Munn said.

Because the two will be spending most of their time in the courts, their main uniforms are business type dark blue sports jackets and grey trousers with shirts and ties.

"But they will be doing two jobs, so we also had to buy the regular sheriff's department uniforms they will wear when on duty here," Munn said.

He added that the salaries for the two deputies and uniform costs will be coming out of his budget and other expenses while upgrading of courthouse security will come from other budget areas.

He said he had full cooperation from the county commissioners in

asking for funds (\$32,000 this year) for salaries and uniforms.

A special committee was set up several months ago to study needs and prepare a plan for court security in the county. Munn said District Judge Daniel Hurbutt acted as chairman and County Commissioner Jim Fraley, also a member, was able to carry information to fellow commissioners as the plan progressed.

The committee also includes Munn, District Judge Daniel Meehl, Prosecutor K. Ellen Baxter, Court Bailiff Bill Foster, and Magistrate Michael Redman, who conducted the initial study of security needs in the local courts.

Munn said the committee will remain in force and will assist the two new security officers in writing a proposed policy and procedure for security operations.

Other sheriffs in Magic Valley are also making plans for handling

court security responsibilities to provide protection for court officials, witnesses and the general public. There have been some acts of violence and some threats in Twin Falls, officers say, but they are few compared to more populated areas. The new security system is expected to serve as a prevention measure as well as a direct protection factor.

The policy that is being drafted, Munn said, will cover not only security procedure, but such things as emergency exits for jurors and court officials, a system for handling keys to the building, emergency lighting and other necessary improvements.

Touchette is a former Twin Falls city police with additional law enforcement background. Tousley also has a number of years in law enforcement and is a former deputy for Sheriff Munn.

## Study could gain tower for Friedman

HAILEY — The Federal Aviation Administration has announced it plans to conduct a safety study on Friedman Memorial Airport, the first step toward winning approval for an air control tower.

FAA made the announcement Thursday, less than a week after agency officials met with airport and community representatives in the Washington office of Sen. James McClure, R-Idaho, to discuss safety concerns at Friedman Memorial.

"Airport officials tell me two major airlines lost interest in serving the Wood River Valley after learning there is no air control tower at Friedman," McClure said. "It's taken too many lives and some action by us to awaken them to concerns the locals have had for years."

Two members of a Boise television news crew and their pilot, an off-duty Boise policeman, were killed Sept. 21 when their single-engine aircraft crashed into a ridge shortly after takeoff from the Hailey airport.

Money to conduct the study will come from funds available to FAA's Northwest Mountain Region Office, McClure said. Findings from the study, which is expected to begin this month, will be used to help determine whether Friedman will

receive FAA money to construct an air traffic control tower.

Airport Manager Paschal Drake, who attended the Washington meeting last week, said that local officials have been talking with the FAA about a control tower for at least the last eight years.

FAA officials have said in the past that traffic at the airport is too light to justify a control tower, Drake said. Friedman had approximately 60,000 aircraft takeoffs and landings during 1986.

However, the FAA may waive traffic level requirements if airports are affected by unique weather patterns, topography or other factors that cannot be included in a cost-benefit analysis.

"It all comes down to safety," Drake said. Pilots must negotiate a mountain terrain to land at Friedman, and Hailey residents are concerned about a new Microwave Landing System that will allow Horizon to land Dash-8s from the north in bad weather, bringing the planes directly over the city.

McClure said the feasibility study is unrelated to recent discussion in the Wood River Valley about construction of a new airport, possibly on Poverty Flats near Bellevue.

The results of the study may help people make up their minds about a decision that locals will have to make for themselves, he said.

## Swan Falls rights bill nears passage

WASHINGTON — The House of Representatives is scheduled to take up Idaho's Swan Falls water rights agreement on Monday, and chief sponsor Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, says he is confident it will be approved.

The legislation directs the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to approve a historic water rights agreement reached between the state and Idaho Power Co. It covers Snake River water rights upstream from the IPC dam at Swan Falls near Boise.

The legislation actually directs FERC, which licenses IPC's hydroelectric dams, to issue an order saying it won't consider the Swan Falls agreement in any future proceeding during the remaining term of the license.

The agreement was negotiated in 1984, after the Idaho Supreme Court ruled that IPC's water rights at the dam, some of which date back to the start of the 20th century, take precedence over upstream water diversion.

If the ruling was allowed to stand, it would have crippled riparian agriculture in southern Idaho. After a deadlock in the state Legislature on the issue, attorneys

for the state and IPC made an agreement that guarantees IPC a minimum stream flow at its dams.

During the Swan Falls controversy state approval of new water rights was held up and then was in tight pressure on state officials to resolve the matter.

And the approval of new water rights is still held up pending federal action on the Swan Falls agreement. The state has not issued permits for permanent water uses such as irrigation since 1983, says Norm Young of the state Department of Water Resources.

"It has been a long and difficult process" getting the legislation through the House, Stallings said Thursday. Last month, the House Energy and Commerce Committee approved the legislation.

It now goes to the Senate, which passed its own version of the legislation earlier. Stallings said he felt the Senate would accept the House bill. The House bill pays much closer attention to the environmental consequences of the Swan Falls agreement.

The House legislation calls for a joint study to determine the impact of stream flows on fish and wildlife habitat in the Snake River Basin, which covers much of southern Idaho.

## Filer district seeks 2-year levy approval

FILER — The Filer School Board is asking patrons to approve a two-year, \$242,000 supplemental levy Nov. 17 to pay off the district's \$434,000 deficit.

The district will use a state law that took effect July 1 to stretch the taxes over two years, if voters approve the override. The district will be the first in the state to ask for a two-year levy, says Mark Fox, chief of the Bureau of Finance of the State Department of Education.

A related new law will also mean that voters will need to be registered with the county to vote in the election. Deadline for registration is today. Area residents can call the district office at 326-5981 to find out if they are registered.

If the override is approved, half of the \$424,000 would be levied in December 1988 and the other \$212,

000 would be levied in 1989. The district currently has a one-year, supplemental levy of \$136,158.

"This amount, combined with district savings and cuts, will pay the interest on the deficit, eliminate the principal on the general fund deficit and put the district on a firm financial base," wrote Superintendent Dave Teater in a newsletter to district patrons.

A homeowner with a taxable market value of \$30,000 would pay about \$65 a year under the new levy proposal. That would be about \$19.60 more than would be per year under the existing supplemental tax and a current emergency tax.

The deficit has been building for three years, Teater says. In fiscal year 1985-86, the state required districts to switch from cash to accrual accounting systems.

That contributed to the deficit

but the "biggest culprit" has been shortfalls in county and state funds, Teater says.

The district also was hurt by cost overruns for construction in 1984-85, but the district expects to pay off the \$49,000 remaining on the project this year, Teater says.

Following the district audit this year, the board asked patrons to contact administrators with suggestions about how to resolve the deficit.

"Many of you contacted the board members and most of the input has been supportive," Teater wrote in the letter to patrons. "A number of community patrons have said that they didn't want the debt hanging over their heads and wanted the district to launch an effort to eliminate the deficit."

While there were also several patrons who said they would not sup-

port supplemental taxes "at any time for any reason," Teater said most of the feedback was positive and the board decided to put the levy to a vote.

The district has also reduced personnel to improve its financial standing.

In the past two years the district has eliminated positions for a music teacher, a building principal, a janitor, a teaching principal at Hollister, a half-time secretary, a cook, a central office secretary, a half-time kindergarten teacher and a part-time art teacher, Teater says.

In addition, the district established a system of buying for equipment, supplies and services that has already saved the district thousands of dollars, he says.

The district will hold a public meeting to discuss the proposed levy Tuesday at 8 p.m. in the high school auditorium.

# Martinez: Lane drove car in Berg killing

DENVER (AP) — A former Ku Klux Klan member from Philadelphia, Thomas Martinez, told a federal jury Thursday that David Lane confided in him that he had driven the getaway car after a road talk show host Alan Berg was gunned down in Denver.

In other testimony, the former grandchild of the late white supremacist leader Robert Mathews said Mathews once told her he was sending a team of men to Denver to kill the 60-year-old radio personality.

Martinez, accused of counterfeiting after his involvement with the white supremacist group The Order, is the second key prosecutor to testify in the trial of Lane and three other Order members accused of civil rights violations in the June 18, 1984, slaying of Berg.

The other defendants are Bruce Pierce, Richard Scutari, and Jean Craig. Prosecutors say Mathews, the founder of The Order, also participated in the murder plot. He was killed in a December 1984 shootout with FBI agents at his hideout on "Whilday" Island, Wash.

Zillah Craig, who bore Mathews' son but was never formally married to him, testified Thursday that Mathews had told her there was a plot to kill Berg. Zillah Craig is the daughter of defendant Jean Craig.

"He said he would send my mother to Denver to do some surveillance work on Zillah Craig," he said.

Then she added, "Bob told me that he, Bruce, Richard and David were going to Denver to kill Alan Berg."

Martinez told the court he never stood trial on the counterfeiting charge because the government had made a deal with him if he would help investigate The Order.

He said he had been a Ku Klux Klan member in Pennsylvania in 1976 and 1977, and in 1980 joined a group called the National Alliance, where he remained a member for three years. Martinez testified the organization was based on the National Socialist Movement, which also followed doctrines espoused by the Third Reich.

Martinez said he met Mathews in 1980 and again when Mathews spoke before the National Alliance Group in September 1983.

After that, Martinez testified, the two conversed during Mathews' visits to Philadelphia and also talked by telephone.

Mathews and Lane came to Philadelphia in January 1984. Martinez said, and Mathews proposed that they "Martinez move to Metairie Falls, Wash., to become involved in counterfeiting to help fund Order activities."

Martinez said he never actually became a member of The Order, but in May 1984 visited Metairie Falls in northern Washington. During the drive back to Spokane, Martinez said, Mathews told him to "keep your eyes and ears open. Something is going to happen in Colorado. Somebody was going to be taken care of."

After he heard of Berg's death, Martinez said he talked by telephone with Mathews and asked him, "There's a lot of news and talk. Was that you?"

"Yep, that was us," Mathews said, according to Martinez's testimony.

Martinez testified that Lane visited him for three days in Philadelphia near the end of June. He said he and Lane were seated at a table and he asked Lane, "What do you know about this Berg stuff?"

He said Lane told him it was the "damn getaway driver."

Martinez also testified that Lane said, "We watched the dirty kids eating dinner."

He said Lane told him Berg had been killed "because he was a Jew causing a lot of problems and the movement against the movement." Lane also said the "intelligence" on Berg was "excellent," Martinez testified.

Zillah Craig had come into the courtroom under heavy security to testify after receiving only verbal immunity for her information, federal prosecutor Barry Kowalski said. But Judge Richard Matsch insisted the woman be granted formal immunity, adding it was his responsibility to protect the constitutional rights of witnesses in his chamber.

Zillah Craig said during the hearing before Matsch that Lane had introduced her to Mathews on Dec. 5, 1983, at the trailer where she lives in Laramie, Wyo. "We fell in love," she said of her relationship with Mathews.

Craig is expected to take a formal oath at Friday morning's court session and repeat her testimony before the jury.

## State gains highway funds

BOISE (AP) — Idaho's getting \$51 million in discretionary interstate highway construction money from the federal government, Gov. Cecil Andrus says.

The money will be used to "close the gaps" in the Interstate 90 route through northern Idaho, the governor said Thursday.

Also, the state will receive another \$1.7 million in discretionary funding. The money will be used to complete a railroad relocation project at Sandpoint, the governor's office said.

The governor's office said it was a one-time allocation of extra construction money, under the 1987 Surface Transportation Act.

The money will be used to construct an interstate viaduct at Wall

and build an 190 stretch from Hilltop to Bennett Bay, east of Coeur d'Alene, Andrus said.

The governor's office said he has directed the Department of Transportation to expedite planning, so the construction work can begin as quickly as possible.

Andrus called the interstate "an important link in our transportation system; and it is important to get it completed."

Another \$51 million in construction funds "will provide a needed shot in the arm to the construction industry," the governor said.

Idaho is one of 10 states which successfully applied for the discretionary funds in the current federal budget, the governor's office said.

## McClure: Pay raise contemptuous

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Jim McClure said a vote by the House of Representatives that would allow the sixth congressional pay raise in four years is "brazen and contemptuous."

"Just how hypocritical can we be," McClure said. "Congress racks up a total of \$645 billion in deficits over four years and each year gives itself a pat on the back with one or more hefty raises."

The pay raise is included as part of a larger act of living adjustment, to increase the salaries of all federal employees three percent. The adjustment was a rider on a tax bill that would raise \$12 billion in new taxes during fiscal year 1988.

House Speaker Jim Wright said he will bring the pay raise back for a second vote late this month, but

McClure castigated him for allowing the raise to be part of the tax bill.

"Congress can fool some of the people some of the time, but I guess he (Wright) found out the American people are usually ahead of Congress on most issues," McClure said. "If the House has the audacity to raise our own pay again, they deserve everything an American people heap on them."

McClure pointed out that if the pay raise approved by the House be rejected by voters and representatives will have averaged an 8 percent annual pay hike during the last four years.

Before January 1984, senators and representatives received annual salaries of \$69,800. Salaries since then have been boosted five times, including the 15.6 percent raise approved last April. That raise topped congressional salaries from \$77,400 to \$89,500 annually.

If the raise approved by the House last Friday becomes law, congressional salaries will increase by 3 percent to \$92,000 per year.

McClure said perhaps the answer is to resurrect a bill he introduced in 1976 that would prevent members of Congress from receiving a raise until they balanced the budget. The bill, titled "The Fiscal Accountability Salary Act," died in committee.

McClure also has co-sponsored legislation that would have prevented members of Congress from receiving a raise shy vote for until the next election after the pay raise was approved.

After voting last winter against the 15.6 percent pay raise, McClure said Congress can vote itself a pay raise after its members have shown the courage to balance the federal budget and cut the national debt.

The whole name of the game here is to hide your vote. Congress isn't brave enough to pass a separate bill raising salaries, but tries to sneak it into another piece of legislation. That way members can say they don't pay the pay raise, but justify their vote by saying they like the rest of the bill," McClure said.

The impact of the minimum stream flows on fish and wildlife at the Deer Flats National Wildlife Refuge was one of many stumbling blocks to passage of the legislation.

State and national environmental groups, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the National Marine Fisheries were concerned the flows in the agreement would hurt the fishery and wildlife.

Rep. John Dingell, chairman of the committee on energy and commerce, led the efforts to ensure these objections were taken care of before House committee approval was sealed.

A Swan Falls bill attached to an appliance energy efficiency bill was passed by Congress last fall but it was vetoed by President Reagan who objected to the appliance bill.

In a letter to Stallings last August, Dingell said the latest Swan Falls bill was not perfect but was far better than the version approved by Congress last year.

# Symms brings petitions for English amendment

WASHINGTON — Sen. Steve Symms believes making English the official language of the United States is an idea whose time has come, and he wants to amend the Constitution to do it. In a display of widespread grass-roots backing for Symms' proposed English Language Amendment, representatives of the English First movement presented Symms with over 200,000 petitions urging passage of the amendment at a news conference Thursday.

"This is evidence that Americans realize the place of the English language in our society," Symms said after receiving the petitions unloaded from a truck at the Capitol steps.

Larry Pratt, president of English First, claims his organization has over 100,000 members who want Congress to pass the constitutional amendment. In order to be added to the Constitution, the legislatures of 37 states must endorse the amendment within seven years after Congress approves it.

A House Judiciary Committee, which first must approve Symms' proposal before a full Senate vote, said there was little chance of success for the English Language Amendment.

"A wide array of ethnic, civil rights and education groups oppose Symms' plan as divisive and anti-ethnic. Groups opposing the amendment include the Organization of Chinese Americans, the Civil Rights Leadership Conference, the National Education Association (NEA), the Congressional Hispanic Caucus, and the League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC)."

Symms has cited studies that nearly 27 million Americans, mostly of Hispanic origin, lack minimal skills in the English language.

But George Rodriguez of LULAC said Thursday in a telephone interview that an English-only constitutional amendment does nothing to promote English proficiency among Hispanics.

"All Symms has accomplished with his amendment is to provide the English-only movement with a rallying point for fear-of-

foreign culture in the United States," Rodriguez charged.

Under questioning at the press conference, Symms did not specify how amending the Constitution would address the problem of English deficiency. He said he supports "structured immersion programs to teach immigrants English, but offered no specific policy remedies. Symms said bilingual education is the main cause of English deficiency. He claimed studies have shown that bilingual education programs, designed to help assimilate immigrants into American society, have actually increased the number of functionally illiterate Americans.

"Bilingual programs have pushed English into a second-class status," he charged. They rob Americans of language skills and the opportunity to enjoy the benefits of our thriving society."

Some opponents, such as Michael Ponds of the NEA, say Symms' proposal raises the question of whether laws authorizing funding to the states for bilingual school programs, could be ruled unconstitutional.

Ponds said California voters last November approved an English-first statute which the state's Republican governor George Deukmejian has used to veto spending for bilingual education in California.

At the press conference, however, Symms said such laws would not be affected by his amendment.

Rodriguez said opposition to the English-only movement is one of LULAC's top three priorities. He said LULAC president Oscar Moran will meet with President Reagan on Friday where he will express the Hispanic community's concern about Symms' plan.

Idaho's three Republican members of Congress are supporting English the country's official language, including Symms, Sen. James McClure and Rep. Larry Craig.

But spokespersons for McClure and Craig say their bosses have not yet taken a position on a constitutional amendment to accomplish this. Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, is still considering whether or not having an official language is a good idea.

# Farmers' class action suit seeks halt to foreclosures

BOISE (AP) — A sweeping class action lawsuit filed in federal court here asks the judiciary system to forbid foreclosing on debt-plagued farmers until Congress and the administration stop deficit spending and correct foreign trade problems.

Daniel Hawley, Mountain Home, former assistant U.S. attorney for Idaho, filed the lawsuit Tuesday on behalf of seven farm couples and companies across the state. The lawsuit seeks to be certified as a class-action suit, which would allow it to cover all farmers in the same situation.

The lawsuit alleges the farmers involved have been plunged into debt they can't repay, through no fault of their own, and are on the verge of losing farm properties to foreclosure.

The farmers went into debt, using reasonable income assumptions. But because of the way Congress has allowed uncontrolled deficit spending, and because of the administration's foreign policies, farm prices have dropped so production costs have soared, the lawsuit said.

It asked that farmers be protected from "foreclosure and the foreseeable confiscatory effects" of Congress' economic and fiscal policies.

It asked for a court order banning deficit spending and foreign trade policies detrimental to U.S. farmers.

U.S. District Judge Marion Callister, after a hearing, refused to grant a temporary restraining order as requested by Hawley. But he allowed 30 days for Hawley to submit written arguments in support of a request for a preliminary injunction, and said the government would have 10 days to respond.

# Citizen groups seeking delay in halting shutoff moratorium

BOISE (AP) — A coalition of citizen groups wants the Public Utilities Commission to reconsider its decision to eliminate the state's winter moratorium on utility service shutoffs.

Representatives of more than 20 community agencies, consumer organizations, churches and senior citizen groups petitioned the PUC Thursday for a hearing to reconsider the policy change, which takes effect Dec. 1.

Today is the last day for public comment on the order, which was issued by the commission in early October in an attempt to make utilities' low-income customers more responsible for their winter heating bills.

Wanda Michaelson, executive director of the Idaho Hunger Action Council, urged the commission to delay implementation of the change for at least one year.

The current rules were issued following extensive hearings in 1980. At those hearings, it was found that there had been tens of thousands of

utility service terminations which had the potential to endanger the life and health of our senior citizens, babies and the infirm," Ms. Michaelson's group said in a press release.

"We expect that the Idaho Public Utilities Commission will listen to the public during the hearings we are requesting around the state, and that they will restore this protection to people who find themselves in emergency circumstances."

The PUC's current rules effectively prohibit termination of gas and electric service in December, January and February. But commissioners say the rule has resulted in some utility customers being able to get winter service without any payment at all.

That leads to some "substantial unpaid bills" at the end of each winter, making the debt problem for low-income families even worse and collection efforts for gas and electric suppliers more difficult, the PUC said.

# Individual exposure tests sought

POCATELLO (AP) — A citizens group has asked the Environmental Protection Agency to intensify its radionuclide study in southeastern Idaho by monitoring individual exposure.

In a letter to the EPA, the Citizens Task Force on Toxics said the two-year study should employ personal monitoring devices to measure human exposure to radioactive phosphate sludge in addition to fixed-location monitoring equipment.

The \$600,000 study originally proposed use of those devices to determine the effects of radiation exposure in the home and workplace, but they were excluded in the final proposal after EPA's Science Advisory Board decided what it called the "liability aspect" of monitoring occupational exposure, an EPA official said.

Casey Meredith, task force coordinator, contended the study would be incomplete and have decreased accuracy unless the devices are used.

# Greenfield dies at 71

In 1971, Greenfield represented labor as a member of the Governor's Advisory Committee on Workman's Compensation.

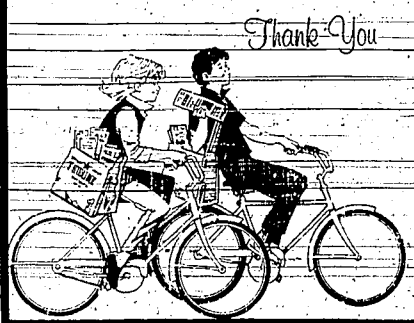
At that time, Idaho's workman's compensation laws were among the worst in the country. They had not been updated since 1917. He drafted updated laws, which were later adopted.

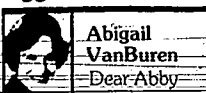

## Will Gorbachev bring along his better half?

WASHINGTON — The unanswered question around the White House and the State Department this week will be whether Mikhail Gorbachev will bring his wife, Raisa, to Washington in a month.

Gorbachev's letter to President Reagan proposing a summit date and an agenda apparently never got into the incidentals of the visit — if one can call Mrs. Gorbachev incidental.

Unofficial observers of the Soviet scene say that it's not surprising the Soviet first lady hasn't been mentioned yet, since the Soviets don't place the same emphasis on the participation by their leader's wife in official life that Americans place on theirs.

Before Mrs. Gorbachev, the wives of Soviet leaders were seldom seen in public, and almost never heard from.

"A wife taking part is totally new to them," says Betty Bumpers, president of Peace Links, a grass-roots effort that sent an 18-member delegation to the Soviet Union last month at the invitation of the Soviet Women's Committee.

representative from her Soviet republic and not as the wife of the general secretary.

"They are very proud of her," said Bumpers. "I never heard any negative criticism of her."

In fact, Bumpers said that since she had been in Moscow last winter, "I don't know whether it's Raisa's influence or the fact that there is a lot more exposure because Americans are everywhere" but the Soviet women are dressing better, their haircuts are better, there is definitely a difference in how they look.

Bumpers' report provides a somewhat softer view of how Raisa Gorbachev is perceived at home than that brought back by another recent visitor, who says the attention paid Mrs. Gorbachev is contributing to suspicions that "a cult of personality" is growing up around the Gorbachevs.

"They believe that women should be seen but not heard, that Raisa is too visible, that she has no significant influence and that her image is the product of the western media," said this source.

## Stocks have little effect on retail sales

The collapse in the stock market apparently has not caused the majority of Americans to change their spending habits, retail industry analysts said after reviewing October sales results of the nation's largest retailers.

"They don't indicate any major downturn, any major deviation from what we had been seeing," said Jeffrey B. Edelman, an analyst with the investment firm Drexel Burnham Lambert Inc. "Middle America is still spending."

Retail sales generally have been sluggish throughout this year, and for October, the retailers' reported sales which were in line to slightly below expectations," said Jeffrey Feiner, an analyst with Merrill Lynch & Co. Inc.

Since the \$500 billion collapse of the stock market Oct. 19, many economists have predicted consumers will cut back their spending.

"While it's obviously difficult to ascertain the impact of Black Monday on total sales results, we nevertheless believe that the overall retailing environment was not importantly impacted and in essence remains sluggish," Feiner said.

Monroe H. Greenstein, an analyst with Bear Stearns & Co. Inc., said if there was any effect from the stock market, it was reflected in results reported by stores serving higher-income customers. For example, Carter-Hawley Hale Stores Inc., which owns chains including the Broadway stores in California and the Southwest, suffered a 2.7 percent decline in October sales. Carter-Hawley Hale reported its cumulative sales over the last 39 weeks rose 4.5 percent.

Sears Roebuck & Co., the nation's largest retailer, reported its sales rose 1 percent last month from October 1986 levels, while its 39-week

## Weaker dollar, dropping rates net gain for stocks

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market chalked up a broad gain Thursday, encouraged by falling interest rates and hopes that U.S. manufacturers would benefit from a weak dollar in foreign exchange.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks had fallen 68.80 points Tuesday and Wednesday, recovered 40.12 to 1,985.41.

Advancing issues outnumbered declines by nearly 3 to 1 on the New York Stock Exchange, with 2,276 up, 439 down and 291 unchanged. Big Board volume totaled 225.96 million shares, against 202.53 million in the previous session. On the heels of interest-rate declines in Britain,

sales were up 3.4 percent. Analysts attributed the sluggishness at Sears to stronger sales in September that detracted from the company's October performance.

J.C. Penney & Co. Inc. said its October sales soared 9.1 percent while its year-to-date sales rose 5.2 percent.

Kmart Corp. said its overall sales rose 6.7 percent last month and 7.8 percent so far this year. Its comparative sales — those for stores open at least 9 months — were up 9.7 percent in October and 3.8 percent for the 39-week period.

Wal-Mart Stores Inc. reported a 40-percent increase in October sales and a 36 percent jump for the first

West Germany and Switzerland Wednesday and early Thursday, rates fell in the U.S. credit markets.

Numerous U.S. banks lowered their prime lending rates from 9 percent to 8 1/2 percent.

With the drop in rates lately, many analysts believe the chances of a severe recession stemming from the stock market crash last month have been reduced.

As measured by Wilshire Associates' index of more than 5,000 actively traded stocks, the overall market gained \$4.61 billion, or 1.93 percent, in value.

The Big Board's composite index of all its listed common stocks added 2.70 to 141.81.

The figures reported Thursday are from general retailers and apparel stores, and do not include sales of supermarkets or auto dealerships.

## Trus Joist rates 163rd on Forbes list

BOISE (AP) — Trus Joist Co. has been rated No. 163 on Forbes magazine's list of the 200 Best Small Companies in America.

The ranking did not surprise President and Chief Executive Walter Minnick. He has set his sights on \$500 million in sales and Fortune 500 status within five years.

"No, I'm not surprised," Minnick said Wednesday in a telephone interview — from Minneapolis.

"I'm very pleased with the recognition. It's evidence of the company's recent growth, strong performance and upward prospects.

"Our success has been accelerating over the (five-year) listing period, and I'm confident we'll do even better next year."

The ratings, which appear in the magazine's Nov. 16 issue, were based on companies' five-year average return on equity, or profit as a percentage of net worth.

Value Line, a New York-based financial-publishing firm, finished No. 1 with a five-year average return of 70.8 percent. Trus Joist's five-year average was 13.7 percent. Over the past 12 months, return was 21.6 percent.

The five-year average for the 200 companies was 17.4 percent; the median for 12 months was 20.7 percent.

Trus Joist's sales of \$223.9 million. The company has shown it can be

ranked at 28th among the 200. Its profits of \$20.64 million ranked it No. 70.

Minnick said Trus Joist's growth has been fueled by spectacular growth in the company's residential structural products and its wood-window business.

The residential products are the company's wooden I-joists and its Micro-Lam, a patented, laminated wood product used chiefly for beams.

Over the past four years, sales growth of residential products has averaged 20 percent. Sales are up 44 percent since August, Minnick said.

Trus Joist has acquired two wood-frame window businesses in the past 18 months. Their sales are growing more than 20 percent a year, he said.

"We've done very well this year, even though housing starts have fallen off," Minnick said.

The reason is that Trus Joist has been a strong contractor in the growing repair and remodeling market, said stock analyst Charles Albert, who follows Trus Joist for Shearson Lehman Bros. in New York.

But beyond that, Albert said, there are three good reasons for Trus Joist's success:

The company has shown it can be

profitable, whether sales are up or down. Even in 1982, when sales dropped to \$67 million, Trus Joist made money, he said.

Trus Joist uses expert marketing techniques.

"They sell a Cadillac product with Cadillac service," Albert said, "and they are flexible enough to be in the hot housing markets at the hot times, so they will be there even if overall markets decline."

They have excellent employee relations. When times were tough, Albert said, Minnick went straight to the employees and urged everybody to take a wage cut, including management. And everyone did.

Albert and Minnick differ some-

what on Trus Joist's path to \$500 million in sales and a spot on the Fortune 500.

"They won't make \$500 million as they are structured now," Albert said. "They will have to acquire probably two more companies."

Minnick said Trus Joist is exploring acquisitions, especially in wood-frame windows, but there is nothing now in the works.

"We're planning on the growth to be attained. Our chairman of the board is still fairly bullish if something comes out of the woodwork, we'll certainly look at it."

# Vandals could nail down Big Sky championship Saturday

The University of Idaho can clinch the Big Sky Conference football championship this weekend, with a little help from league newcomer Eastern Washington.

The Vandals, 7-2 overall and 5-1 against conference opponents, are ranked 10th in NCAA Division I-AA and are alone atop the Big Sky standings. If they can beat 1-8, 0-6 Montana State on Saturday, and Eastern Washington beats 13th-ranked Weber State, the title will be theirs.

But while Eastern Washington might be willing to cooperate, Montana State and Weber State can be expected to raise some understandable objections.

"Right now, we're where we want to be, but we have to stay there," said Idaho coach Keith Gilbertson.

maining while the Vandals have only two.

But last week's loss did not put Weber State coach Mike Price in a funk or change his goals for the season. Saturday's opponent is only 2-4 in the league and 4-6 on the season. A victory over the Eagles would keep Idaho's championship drive and restore the Wildcats' Big Sky lead if the Vandals should stumble in Bozeman.

"We're still trying for the championship," said Price, anticipating a possible Division I-AA playoff game against Idaho with a sweep of the last three regular-season contests. "We've still got a lot of big games and a lot of things we think we can accomplish."

Other Big Sky games on Saturday include 2-3 Boise State at 3-2 Nevada-Reno, 2-3 Idaho State at 3-3 Montana, and 4-2 Northern Arizona

travels to Oklahoma for a nonconference game against Tulsa.

Idaho's Gilbertson has every right to be nervous about a letdown against Montana State. The Vandals would appear to have a breather after winning four straight high-pressure games thanks to a defense that seems to play just well enough to win and a career passing season from sophomore quarterback John Friesz.

But the cellar-dwelling Bobcats will be playing at home, where they suffered a painful 55-7 loss to Montana last week in front of 17,027 fans, the largest crowd ever to attend a sporting event in the state. Then there is the lingering humiliation of having failed to score against the Vandals in Bozeman since 1981.

It doesn't take a rocket scientist to guess Montana State would like nothing better than to play the

spoiler this weekend.

Nevada-Reno will try to keep its own faint title of at least playoff hopes alive when it hosts the struggling Boise State Broncos. Both teams are 4-4 overall, but the Wolf Pack was every bit's preseason pick to repeat as Big Sky champions while Boise State was expected to have a rebuilding year.

The Broncos hope to end the nightmare of blowing leads to lose their last two games, to Idaho State and Division I Utah.

"We want to win these last three games — one at a time," Boise State coach Dave Vanhooknight said. "We've had some tough breaks. Just when you think you're going to have it, it slips away from you."

In Missoula, 4-4 Montana hosts 2-5 Idaho State in a battle of the giant killers. Idaho State got thumped last week by Nevada-Reno, but ear-

lier this season handed Idaho its only Big Sky loss and beat Boise State on the road.

"They are a very, very underrated, very complete football team," Montana coach Don Read said of the Bengals. "When you look at their running backs, receiver and quarterbacks, you look at some talented people with excellent overall speed."

ISU coach Jim Koetter said he plans to pay special attention to the Grizzlies' special teams, which blocked four punts last week against Montana State and one the week before against Weber State.

"They play hard and make big plays," Koetter said. "We have to not make any errors in our punting and not give up any big plays in there. That is going to be a difficult chore for us this week, and I think that's going to be a big part of the ball game."

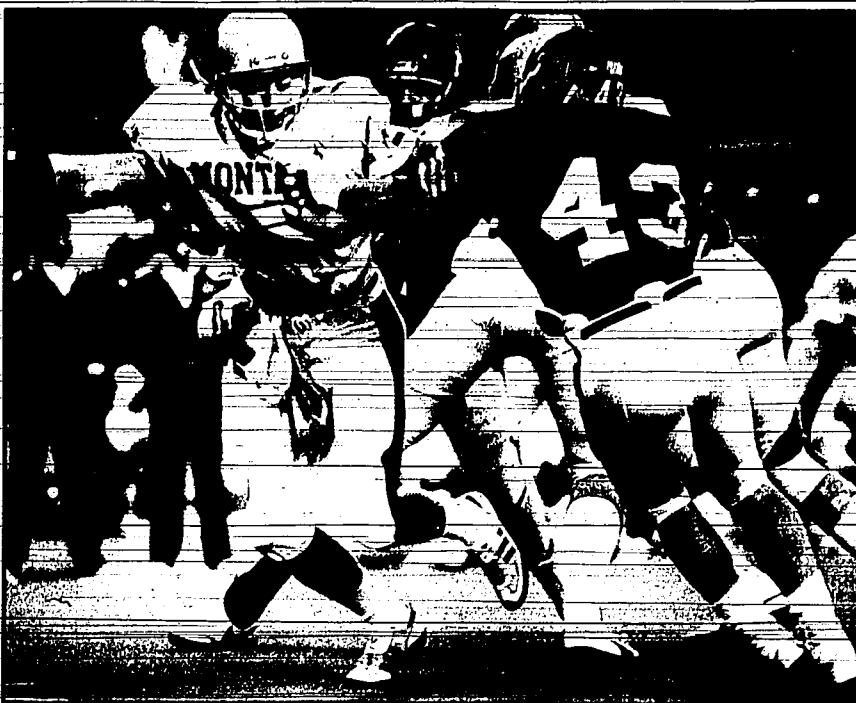

## Twin Falls' Rice, Sellers have varied stints in strikeball

Lance Sellers began his three-week NFL career in a scuffle with striking NFL veterans and ended it with torn knee ligaments and a Cincinnati-Bengals contract.

Mike Rice started and ended it the same way, waiting in a Washington, D.C., area hotel room for the chance to play.

But both Twin Falls High graduates say their three-week experiences in the NFL were something they wouldn't trade for anything.

"It was very interesting," says Rice, a 1983 TFHS graduate who was an All-America punter and wide receiver two seasons ago at the University of Montana and was signed by the Washington Redskins as a replacement player.

"You found out about living in a hotel for a month. I didn't suit up for any game but I was very happy to get back to receiving. We were working out every day."

"For me, getting to play in the NFL was a dream come true," says Sellers, a 1982 TFHS graduate who played outside linebacker at Boise State and ended up starting three games at inside linebacker for the replacement Cincinnati Bengals. "It was a chance I didn't feel I got at Miami (where Sellers was a sixth-round draft choice last spring). I've got a contract, some experience and a chance to make the team next summer."

Sellers injured his knee on the first defensive play of the Bengals' final replacement game, and three weeks ago when a Cleveland Browns guard — a veteran — cut back at Sellers was pursuing a Cleveland running back and hit Sellers' knee from the side, tearing ligaments. He underwent arthro-



scopic surgery four days later, but he healed sufficiently to go hunting. Now living in Boise, he undergoes therapy on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and will fly back to Cincinnati later this month to have the Bengals' doctors check his knee.

"It's a good situation for me," Sellers says. "I've been all winter for therapy, working out and getting the knee stronger. I got calls from a couple of teams, St. Louis and Atlanta, after the strike ended asking if I'd be interested in signing with them, but I'm going to stick with the Bengals. I'll go back next summer with some solid experience and knowing the defense, and I think that will be a real advantage."

Sellers' experience at inside linebacker was his first. He played defensive end at TFHS and later at • See NFL on Page C3

Jim Paxson, the only current Blazer who played with Lucas in Portland, said the bitterness that accompanied Lucas' departure eight years ago was history.

"Time heals a lot of things," Paxson said. "Jack was here then and he's gone. Everyone's new from those days except for the owner (Larry Weinberg) and me."

Lucas had his best pro years in Portland. He was the leading scorer in the team's championship season, averaging 20.2 points per game. As a Blazer, he played in the All-Star Game three times.

Last season, he averaged 7.9 points and 4.9 rebounds per game, the lowest figures of his 13-year pro career.

"I'll have to see how he fits in," said Portland center Steve Johnson. "He helped Seattle last year with leadership off the bench, rebounding and playing defense."

Paxson said Lucas' value will be greatest in post-season play.

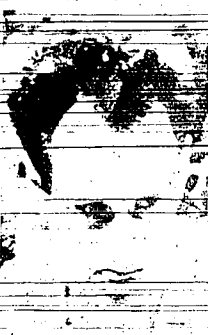

McEnroe has failed to win a tournament on the Grand Prix circuit in more than a year and Lendl says that the American is in danger of tarnishing his image as an all-time great with below-par performances.

"If he is going to keep on and not improve the level of his game he is producing right now it would be better if he retires quickly because he is really hurting his image in terms of his tennis," Lendl said. "I think he will always be remembered for two things, his genius and his behavior. What will be more in the front of the memory is his behavior, not his tennis. I think he will be remembered for his genius," McEnroe, who was ranked No. 1 in the world for four years until he was replaced by Lendl in 1984, is currently serving a two-month suspension. At last week's Euro event, McEnroe's Community Championships, which is part of the official ATP circuit, McEnroe talked of plans to play for a further two years.

But Lendl, who won the tournament by beating Czechoslovak Miloslav Mecir in Sunday's final, predicted McEnroe's career may end with his long-time girlfriend, Samantha Frankel, not to have children while he still tops the world rankings.

"He may be talking about two years but I would not be surprised if

he would quit tennis. I really wouldn't," Lendl said in an interview after the tournament.

Lendl also said that McEnroe's attempt at a comeback from a seven-month suspension last year was made even more difficult by his family life. McEnroe and his wife, Tatiana, recently became parents to a second child.

Lendl, a 27-year-old Czechoslovak who lives in Greenwich, Conn., said he would not fall into the same predicament. He has made a pact said McEnroe's career may end with his long-time girlfriend, Samantha Frankel, not to have children while he still tops the world rankings.

TWIN FALLS — Comedy is back and it's a laughing matter.

After a serious decline during the Vietnam years, the urge to smile has increased from a prolonged grin to a guffaw. Now, it is no longer necessary to turn on the tube or travel to major city clubs to get your jollies. Twin Falls has become a prime stop on the road of one-night-stands.

David Tribble, a Boise booking agent, is largely responsible for recognizing a growing trend and deciding to capitalize on it. Tribble, who has booked more than 200 acts in the Northwest, says he saw that regional circuits, called "backroads circuits," were catching on across the country. He concluded that fully scheduled Boise clubs could do with the elimination of a couple of slow nights per week. By routing together one-night-stands in the southern part of the state, Tribble found he could attract better talent as well as make the two Boise clubs more profitable.

Using the name 'Laughline,' the new Southern Idaho Spud Circuit was born last year. "In my 13 months of booking comedy," Tribble says, "I learned that we have comics coming from small towns that are as good as those coming from major metropolitan areas. I thought I could put them to work."

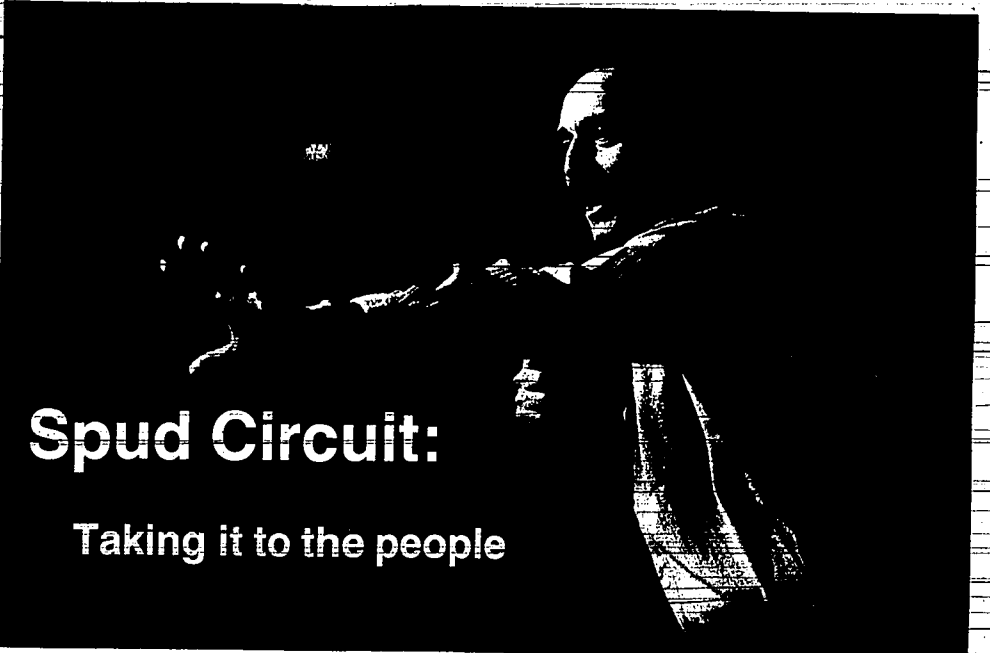
Enough rooms are now available in southern Idaho to make it profitable for comics to make the Spud Circuit a regular part of their performance season. And regional audiences have now come to expect their share of the best talent available.

In Twin Falls, Kevin Brown developed Tribble's Laughline at the lounge room in the Canyon Springs Inn.

"Southern Idaho was an open market for comedy," he says. "There hadn't been anything like this down here. But, since there isn't a large population, our biggest concern was whether the business would sustain it in the long run."

Brown says there was a risk that one or more of the rooms serviced by the circuit might fail, leaving gaps in the schedules. They were worried that the circuit could not offer a full schedule of one-nighters leaving talent hesitant to come.

"We're in good shape now, however," Brown says. "Elkhart only closes during their transition between seasons. Freddy's, in Pocatello, is doing well enough and I think it's the same for George K's over in Burley."



## Spud Circuit: Taking it to the people

Looking for laughs at Diamondfield Jack's, Jim Nenopoulos is one of many comics coming to Idaho to play the Spud Circuit.

"I see the figures for our own room — the take at the door, the crowd, the steady growth. I'm happy with steady growth. If our comedy nights had started out red-hot, I would have felt suspicious. There's generally only one direction business goes when it starts at that level."

Brown says, and Tribble agrees, that the Magic Valley has a broadly based audience potential. Twin Falls and Pocatello have large college popu-

lations that boost attendance figures as well. But both men say audiences are a good mix of farmers, blue collar workers, students and people who just get up and go to work every day.

"If we went strictly for the college crowd, I doubt that our Laughline night would have lasted more than a few weeks," Brown says. "We see people from 70 years old on down to 20. We promote and continue to create the image of our-

room without relying on any one kind of customer."

While the comic talent and the audience response to the Spud Circuit has been mostly positive, there are liabilities that make these one-nighters less than perfect.

Comedian Jay Walker plays Twin Falls like he lives here. "I love the local audience," he says. • See COMEDY on Page D2

## Up close with pop singer Patti Page

JACKPOT Nov. — Jack Rael has been Patti Page's manager for 41 years and he is proud of his star.

Page is scheduled to perform tonight and Saturday night at Cactus Pete's in Jackpot, Nev.

"Patti and I have the longest manager-artist association in all of show business," Rael said Wednesday by telephone from his home in North Hollywood, Calif. "None have been together longer... and we're still active."

Rael talked about Page with enthusiasm and sincerity, but also with the polish of a promoter who has given more than one interview about his artist.

Until maybe the last two or three years, he said, Page has been the all-time best-selling female vocalist in the world, with 157 singles and 80 albums.

Superstar pop vocalists today, such as Madonna and Whitney Houston, may have edges on Page in the best-selling department, Rael said. But Page has been able to perform and record continuously since 1948 because she is an exceptional, enduring performer, he said.

"Patti is a better singer," Rael said frankly. "She's one of the purest singers there in. People come to see Patti to listen to the hits she's had and to listen to her sing. It's a style everybody knows."

Describing some of that style, Rael said Page originated the idea of walking through the audience with a cordless microphone, sing-

ing to and talking with her fans. "She was the first to do that," the manager said. "A lot of people do it now."

Is Patti married? Does she have children? Does she like to stay out late? Is her hair really blond? What kind of car does she drive? What does she like to eat?

Rael says the star has a special song that answers these and other

common things everyone wants to know about Patti Page.

"It's an accumulation of questions people have asked her, and she sings about it," Rael said. He noted that Page is not married. She has a son, age 23, and a daughter, age 24. She does like to stay out late and her favorite hobby is playing bridge.

In her annual performance

schedule, Page leaves her Rancho Santa Fe home north of San Diego, Calif., and travels about 20 weeks per year. Her most recent appearances were with the symphonies in Minneapolis, Minn., and Cheyenne, Wyo., and with another 80-piece orchestra in Calgary, Canada.

In Jackpot, Page will perform with a small group of musicians made up of a trumpet, trombone, saxophone, piano, bass and drums.

In a medley of hits, Page touches some of the big songs that made her famous, including "Mockingbird-Hill," "Old Cape Cod," "You Belong to Me," "Allegheny Moon" and "How Much Is That Doggie in the Window." The gem of every show has to be Page's hit "Tennessee Waltz," which sold more than 70 million copies in the early 1950s.

Page lends her talent to a variety of styles, Rael said, such as her salute to Duke Ellington, new songs like "The Rose" or "The Way You Make Me Feel" and Page's country hit, "Walkin' the Floor Over You."

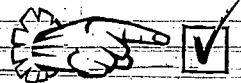
"She's actually...country-pop," Rael said. "Patti was one of the first."

In her promotional photograph, Page has all the delicate beauty of a new star.

## Anita Baker looks beyond 'Rapture'

NEW YORK — Anita Baker has a way of wrapping a song around her body and eagerly caressing it like a hungry lover. It is that intimacy, laced with her talented jazz-pop-soul styling, that has sent the award-winning vocalist soaring up the charts with one of the best love song albums of the year.

"Rapture" has sold more than 3 million copies and was No. 22 on Sept. 28, its 77th week in Cashbox magazine's best-selling list.

The 29-year-old Baker grew up in Detroit. She won two Grammys this year, as best female rhythm 'n' blues vocalist for "Rapture," and as writer of the best R & B song, "Sweet Love." Critics have applauded her smoky style and have compared her to Whitney Houston and Sade.

Baker began the six-month second leg of an American tour in mid-July, which carried her to New York and a recent four-day, sold-out stint at Radio City Music Hall. She discussed her career in an interview with The Associated Press.

Q. Are you doing a follow-up album to "Rapture"?  
A. "I'm doing the worst part of pre-production, which is listening to a backlog of six months of tapes. Tapes are submitted daily. We're trying to come up with a concept for the next album. This is the toughest

part. Once the concept is here, I know where I'm going. Right now I'm just taking songs that sound good to me and seeing if I can sing them properly."  
Q. What was the concept for "Rapture"?  
A. "Fireise love songs, with jazz, blues and gospel overtones: It was very simple, but I need to set up some kind of criteria so I know what I'm looking for."

## Art works are bringing in top dollars this fall

Glittery with high-prasale estimates and jitters from a wildly volatile stock market, New York's fall auction season is off and running. A Gutenberg Bible from the Estelle Dobben Collection set the pace Oct. 22 when Japanese book seller Maruzen Co. Ltd. brought it for \$4.9 million. Christie's had predicted the rare Bible would bring \$1.5 million to \$2 million.  
Now auction watchers have shifted their gaze to the next big attraction, in fact the season's crown jewel: the sale of Vincent van Gogh's "Irises," Nov. 11 at Sotheby's. The third work from Van Gogh's highly prized late period to go on the block this year, "Irises" is expected to bring between \$21 million and \$38 million. If the selling price falls within that wide range, "Irises" will be the second most expensive painting to sell at auction, but it will not break a record for the

modern Dutch master (Auction houses typically estimate selling prices prior to sales and publish them in catalogs).  
The most costly painting ever sold at auction is Van Gogh's "Sunflowers," purchased for \$39.9 million last March by Yasuda Fire and Marine Insurance in Tokyo. The Van Gogh sale more than tripled the previous record (\$11.1 million, paid in 1986 for a Paris street scene by Edouard Manet) and stunned the art world.  
While some observers have worried that the price of art has gone out of sight for all but the world's wealthiest collectors, others have argued that the "Sunflowers" purchase was an aberration, brought about by Japan's abundance of cash, the Japanese love of Impressionism and the popularity of Impressionism strongly identified with a painter perceived as a tragic hero. Both sides felt vindicated in June when another late Van Gogh, "Le

Pont de Trinquetaille," was sold for \$20.2 million to an unidentified German-speaking collector in Europe.  
Offered in the wake of the stock market plunge and subsequent fluctuations, "Irises" may prove to be the most closely watched Van Gogh yet. Collectors who say that "Irises" is a better, though admittedly less popular, painting than "Sunflowers" speculate about a new record, while others foresee a return to reason, forced by an unstable economic climate.  
Painted in 1889, the year of the artist's death, the canvas depicts a corner of the garden in the Saint-Remy asylum where he spent his final days. The painting is in the late Joan Whitney Payson's collection and has been an extended loan to Westbrook College in Portland, Me.  
Van Gogh is not the only artist who has collectors talking. In the same sale with "Irises" are Georges Braque's 1914 Cubist oil "Le Violon,

from the Phillips Collection in Washington (expected to bring \$3 million to \$4 million), Claude Monet's shimmering Impressionist garden "Le Jardin Fleuri" (\$3 million to \$4 million), and Paul Cezanne's airy landscape "Arbres et Maisons au Bord de l'Eau," from the Art Institute of Chicago (\$2 million to \$3 million).  
A 1952 painting of a woman and a baby carriage (No. 5) by Pablo Picasso are a 1907 Impressionist street scene, "Boulevard de Clichy" (\$2 million to \$3 million).  
In Christie's \$40 million sale of Impressionist and modern paintings and sculpture on Nov. 10, Austrian Expressionist Egon Schiele's 1913 painting of a "tormented" couple, "Liebespaar," (Mann and Frau I), is a rare offering, expected to bring \$4 million to \$5 million. One of Monet's waterlily paintings bears an estimate of \$2.5 million to \$3 million.

Locals are the best test for how I'm doing artistically."  
Walker is a veteran of a few decades of circuit work across the nation and now makes his home in Spokane, Wash. He has been seen several times on the Johnny Carson Show and played in some of the best known clubs in metropolitan areas.  
But his material is infused with more than a smattering of local color. He knows regional rivalries, local political gaffs and uses that knowledge to pull his audience up to comedy based on broader subjects and circumstances.  
"This is work that requires research. But after all, who is paying the cover charges and buying the drinks? Every audience deserves my respect," says Walker as he satiates by doffing his toupee.  
Walker says he isn't surprised by the success of the Spud Circuit, adding that if urban centers were the only places to tell jokes, even Carson wouldn't have lasted.  
"Sure, we had some bad years and even more bad rooms, but laughter survives," he says. "Some of those years were tough. I lost some weight, but we're up again, and frankly, I'm glad to be able to perform closer to my home and family."  
"Even now though, there are some places I find hard to play. Economic depression stresses the humor out of people. When I play those places, including my hometown, it's hard work. Sometimes I just won't go back until I see a saving, economically, in that particular city or town."  
Jebb Fink, from Coeur d'Alene, is considerably younger than Walker and is a typical example of the richly talented younger comedian bank.  
"This work is hard because of the travel and the pace and that is relentless," he says. "I'm always shifting gears, heading 90 percent of the time and playing most clubs three or four times a year. In order to work the clubs I particularly want, I have to book nine months ahead. That means that I am contractually bound to the exclusion of any extended career opportunities that may spontaneously come knocking."  
A rehabilitated addict, Fink's show is riddled with drug ridicule, a subtle fight against use and abuse. "I'm concerned for the guy in

trouble," he says.  
Fink has played southern Idaho four times in the past year. "I was here during the second week of the circuit," he says. "It was the most organized I had ever seen in my five-year career."  
Other comedians echo that attitude about the Spud Circuit's setup, speaking well of the clubs and the primed audiences.  
"It is the patrons who voice the most positive and negative remarks. Like the comedians, they too, react to the noisy and poorly designed rooms."  
The Burley Inn, now closed to comedy, got very low marks. George Kie, a small room with some slight problems, is able to overcome inadequacies because the audience is supportive of laughter. Freddy's, in Pocatello, has good size and attendance, but the lay out is

awkward, with the entrance too near the stage and the seating too divided.  
Twin Falls has the best room overall, according to responses. There are no uspets created by gaps in the room's seating, the stage is central to three sides of sight and unavoidable noisy areas are well away from the stage.  
Another liability is the comics, unlike those already mentioned, who don't adapt their material to the various regions where they are booked.  
Kevin Brown says "those that still have their stail geared toward the urban centers find themselves faced with a dead room. They aren't invited back. Our success depends on those adjustments."  
Flip Orley, a comedian/hypnotist, says acts must be flexible.  
"There are a lot of comics who

will only work specific circuits, because they're familiar with that particular area," he says. "I want the larger audience. I work all over the country."  
Orley's act is unusual enough that Brown worked for six months to get "him" into Twin Falls. A departure from the one-nighters, Orley works a week of solid runs. The local responses pleases both men. Brown has asked for and gotten a return engagement scheduled for early next year.  
"I know some comics who say, 'this is my act so take it or leave it,'" Orley says. "To the contrary, I think that the talent on stage has to figure out what the audience wants because the bottom line is that one is being paid to entertain and the other is paying to be entertained."

A. "No. I can't write in hotels. I have to be domestic, washing dishes and stuff."  
Q. Where is home?  
A. "I've been in Los Angeles since 1982. Walt (her fiancé, whose last name she will not reveal) and I are looking for a home in Michigan. He's in marketing for IBM in Detroit. We met when I was home visiting my family. I didn't have a record company then. If we can find a house by January, we can have the wedding ceremony in the spring. After I deliver the next album."  
Q. How has fame changed your life?  
A. "I was determined not to change my lifestyle, but I've had to. I was burglarized last year. People were leaving tapes outside my door. People were knocking and getting mad because I didn't respond. I thought they should think about re-opening the door? I signed a lease in a security building with monitors, a switchboard, guards and doorman. There is usually a brawny body guard close by me."  
Q. Did your fame come as fast as it seems to listeners?  
A. "Fame came real fast. I've been around but there was no fame. I was playing the chitlin circuit, virtually unknown. From what you say, I never happy again so I'm trying to milk this puppy for all it's worth."  
Q. Why did fame hit when it did?  
A. "I think what did it was being signed to a major record label (Elektra). They had distribution and a publicist whose job it is to get people to know that I'm here."  
Q. The first dress I had were English robes. I went to England in June 1986. I came back and did Avery Fisher Hall and Radio City, which opened me up to the New York critics. Avery Fisher was a night to remember. My idol, Sarah Vaughan, had performed on that stage the night before."  
Q. Have you met Sarah Vaughan?  
A. "No. I had two tickets to hear her and I didn't take anybody. I didn't want anybody talking while she was singing. I love her so much I didn't go backstage. I could not be one more stupid back there asking her personal questions."  
Q. How are you spending your money?  
A. "I'm putting it away for the (yet unborn) kids' college fund. They don't have to go but I want them to have a choice. I know what I wanted to do when I was 16, which was sing. # Critics aren't always right

## 'Fiddler' panned

Editor's note: The following review was written by Jay Cocks and appeared in Time magazine on Nov. 12, 1971 when "Fiddler on the Roof" was first released. The film features the violin music of Isaac Stern. Time's critic was not happy with the film adaptation of the popular

"Fiddler on the Roof" now joins the company of "Star!" "Hello, Dolly!" "Paint Your Wagon" and "Dr. Doolittle" — the last lumbering dinosaurs from the era of big-budget musicals.

The qualities that have kept the Broadway "Fiddler" running these

several years are in scant supply on screen. Gone with barely a trace are warmth, joy, insight and even the most elementary kind of entertainment. The story of Tevye, the milkman of a small village in czarist-Russia around the time of the pogroms, his nagging wife and his noble daughters, is a modest affair requiring intimate treatment. Instead, it gets a full-scale Holly-

wood production. There is a Panavision screen that does not enlarge the proceedings so much as bloom them, color photography that seems poured over the film like a thickening gravy and a stereophonic sound system that blares the music at high volume and low impact.

The tunes (which rate pretty high by Broadway standards) are more or less intact. The talent is not.

The dances — including an endless wedding celebration — are seemingly performed by one of those middle-European troupes Ed Sullivan used for cultural filler. Most sorely missed is the magnificent Zero Mostel in the role of Tevye, which he created on the stage. He has been replaced for unfathomable reasons by the Israeli star Topol, who labors under the handicap of having to project great amounts of charm and personality when he has none to spare. The credits for "Fiddler" list Norman Jewison as producer and director. On the basis of this and past efforts (The Thomas Crown Affair, Gaily Gaily), he might better be called an anesthesiologist.

Continued from Page D1. Hansen says she was six when she started ballet lessons and gradually developed an interest in dancing. By the time she was 14 she was dancing with the regional ballet company called the Ballet du Lac, based in Portland, Ore.

As a member of the American Festival Ballet, she now teaches company classes six days a week, coaches, rehearses, choreographs and dances. In selecting young dancers Hansen says she also looks for attentiveness, whether they seem to be paying attention and not spacing out. Also if they are natural performers — if they seem to enjoy what they're doing as compared to somebody who looks like their mother said, "Hey, you need to do this." You can always tell if a kid's been kind of pushed into it as compared to one that wants to be there and is happy to be there," she says.

Hansen says the company looks for older dancers who know ballet terminology and can do their movements well. "Again, musicality's... really important," she says. "There's no way that you want to have 12 girls who are all dancing like that in a way a little bit later or a little bit earlier than the music. You have to have them together."

"Also, when it comes to the older girls, I will not take girls that are considerably overweight. That's because the costumes they wear are form fitting and because we're a professional company and we want the best image on stage whether they're our own students or not. That may sound cruel, but it's the way it really is."

Hansen stands, dusting herself off. "QUIET!" she shouts over the din of girls and buzz of electric lights. "I want all the parents out and all the children over here. This is a very big group and a very noisy room. So I don't want any talking."

She adjusts rimless eyeglasses, all business now. She lines up the girls, who stand quietly.

"Do you have to be in here?" she asks a bystander. "Really? Why?"

The observer is sent to a corner. Hansen takes the children through warm-up exercises; then turns on some music and puts them through their paces.

"Step in your spot...hold, hold, hold! Okay, very good!" Hansen moves through the ranks, writing down the ballet dancers' numbers on the back of a copy of a map of Twin Falls.

"Do it until I can see everyone in the room," she says. "There is a lot of people here who didn't see last time, so DON'T STOP!"

The lone boy in the room trips over a foot. A small group of dancers pile and squissus toward Hansen.

"Whon — this is ballet. Did you hear what I said? Go back!"

The children spread apart.

"Okay, good. Stay right where you are please," Hansen writes down a number. She points to a girl in a red leotard. "Will you please do it for me?"

There are deep sighs and yawns as well as looks of studied concentration.

"Who has now done it yet? Okay, go away. Who's next?"

A tiny dancer in a little purple leotard bursts into tears and a friend shepherds her to the side.

"I know auditions are scary and

tells the children before she announces the numbers of those awarded parts. "I wish I had 46 parts to give one to everyone. If I don't call your name, don't be discouraged; just keep working."

Later Hansen says she feels too overwhelmed to put on some of the children who try out for professional performances.

"The mothers always have a lot of questions that really don't need to be asked or answered," she says. "They're not usually too pushy, but there's always going to be a few mothers in every town that feel like they have to be like the manager of their child rather than just letting their kid go in there on their own. And the problem I see with this is that there are children who come out of there with so much pressure that they're carrying, and then, if they don't make it, they feel guilty. They feel sad and they feel more depressed than if their mothers are more relaxed. And I think it's really important that the children do not have any fear of parental disapproval."

The children have gone home and Hansen, dressed in street clothes, is sitting on a bench outside the gym. A little bag is ready to throw into the white van that she and Dan Allers, the ballet's production manager, will be taking up to Hailey, where they'll conduct more auditions.

"I really don't like it when I see mothers dolly up their girls, dressing them up in old costumes which I have had. I've had girls come to auditions where they're wearing their last year's recital costume and their mother's have put makeup on them. And that is unfair to the child. It's not a performance and if they put that much pressure on them, when that child is not chosen, they consider themselves a failure. And they're not. Not one of them is a failure. Sometimes I think it's really unfortunate the pressure the parents put on their children. It's just not fair."

# 'Someone to Watch' an erotic thrill despite flaws

HOLLYWOOD — Ridley Scott's "Someone to Watch Over Me" is an almost curiously gleeful and not-so-pleasantly textured. But, despite its high quality, there is something un-familiar about it, like a poem that does not quite sing, a painting with a color missing.

Scott is an ex-painter, and, as a film maker, he specializes in visual tours de force: shimmering recollections of the past ("The Duellists"), lightning-bright evocations of the future ("Blade Runner" and "Alien"). Here, he steers the sights and sounds of New York in the same dance-photographic splendor. The faces are splendid, too. The movie is about a staturesque New York cop caught in a triangle along with his sexy wife and a stunning murder witness that he has been assigned to guard. The adulterous lovers come from different classes: the cop, Mike Keegan (Tom Berenger) from a middle-range

Queens neighborhood; the witness, Claire Gregory (Mimi Rogers) from the posh heights of Manhattan's Upper East Side.

It is a simple, schematic story, pivoting around two crises: Keegan's failing marriage and the coming homicide by Claire's life. And, at times, all this seems simply a hook on which Scott can hang his dazzling nocturnal urban visions.

Like Woody Allen's "Manhattan," which was also scored to George Gershwin, "Someone" is a love poem to New York. But where Allen fixed on intellectual ambience, Scott — a Britisher who treats the boroughs almost as if they were alien planets — lingers over surfaces. Queens' homes with packed backyards, the leafy sweep of Central Park, Manhattan's teeming heart and the dark-glow of the streets after nightfall. The sound track keeps repeating the lush, plaintive title song — in versions by King, Gene Ammons and Roberta Flack — and the first time we hear it, it is over a spectacular nighttime helicopter shot, high above the city, soaring through the glass canyons

and skyscrapers, crossing the 59th Street Bridge and then zeroing in on Queens.

After this brilliant opening, Scott draws the opposing worlds with great economy and vigor: a work-aholic and dance party in a Spartan, box-daily Queens living room where one bossy blonde in scarlet glows like a plastic rose, and a super-rich spree of Manhattan jet-setters carousing at a dreamily lavish disco. Scott's camera glides through these plush Art Deco rooms and hallways — in chilly, seemingly sub-aqueous light — until we watch, with Claire, a brutal argument and slaying one in which the victim is as hateful as his killer, Joey Venza (Andreas Katsulas).

Murder and fear then trigger love. Berenger's Keegan becomes a Romeo despite himself — Brought into Claire's Upper East Side apartment — where every surface gleams and the light seems filtered through silk — he and her other police bodyguards are treated like delivery boys: forced to cool their heels in the lobby and kitchen by Claire's frizzy-haired, not of a boyfriend (John

Robustein). Gradually — with the inevitability common to discos and movie romances — Keegan and Claire come together, creating the kind of scandal common to soap operas.

Yet, irony aside, the love story works. For the central theme — romance, Rogers and Lorraine Bracco have a sheer photogenic force that makes them fine romantic principals. It is the thriller elements that seem dubious. Scott's gossamer ribbons seem often snagged on the jagged edge of prototypical plotting. The suspense mechanism is far too visible, too obviously a mechanism. The set pieces — the chase through the Guggenheim, one attempted murder — and a Mexican standoff — actually begin to seem trite.

And, at the end, when the two strands are intertwined, the plot has become almost tyrannical: Poor Joey Venza is asked to abandon all activity every scrap of even reasonably psychotic self-preservation, simply to trigger off a properly neat wrap-up and double climax.

Howard Franklin's screenplay

has an ingenious set-up and smooth flow, but it lacks edge and depth. And it also lacks characters, especially the offset, pungent, minor parts that were once the marrow of film noir. There is also an inhaled, Keegan-penetrating Claire's world, but Claire never really enters his, and it might be interesting if she did, if there were one scene, only one, when he took her to Queens. Instead, the movie shows Keegan batted back and forth between his wife and mistress, and, perhaps unintentionally, it degenerates into a contest with too many moral issues solved in advance.

Yet, when the camera simply follows the reckless couple through the dangerous night, washed in cool shadows and jewel-like color, the glamour surges back on. Even if "Someone to Watch Over Me" (MPAA-rated R for sex and violence) is flawed, it is the kind of film that offers you so many subsidiary pleasures; Berenger's watchful blue stare, Bracco's tough accent, Rogers' swanky self-assurance, the flood of gossamer imagery cascading past, and, most of all, Scott's rapturous view of the city. Illogical, flawed or forced thrillers are all too common. Ones that knock your eyes out are rare.

# 'Near Dark' charged with scary romanticism

The following are capsule reviews of some of the movies playing locally in the Magic Valley. The ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

**NEAR DARK (R).** There is a scary poetic charge to this love-come-drama. Southwestern vampire epic, it is much better than "The Last Boys." An Oklahoma kid becomes entranced with a thin, mysterious blonde. When he follows her, she

drinks his blood, introduces him to her maniacal "family" and plunges him into a landscape of endless night; if sunlight touches them, their skin will burn. The sadistic humor and bloodletting — which mostly limits the movie to horror audiences — here collides with an intense romanticism, and director Kathryn Bigelow packs the film with haunting imagery, a lunar desert landscape of Peckinpah violence and Tourneur supernaturalism.

Douglas — and director Adrian Lyne — wind the tension up tight; there is real heat under Lyne's usual gloss. The scariest moments here come not from violence but from flickering moments of everyday pathology pushed to the limit.

**LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON (PG-13).** Warm, imaginative comedy that has a brilliant heart surgeon (Dudley Moore) accidentally exchanging brains with his happy-go-lucky teenage son (Kirk Cameron). With Sean Astin, Catherine Hicks and Patrick O'Neal.

— also indicates the by-the-numbers regularity of the screenwriting (by Jim Kouf) and direction (John Badham) of this tour to superficial film making. What if that such a description omits the impeccable comic timing of Richard Dreyfuss and the high-gloss beauty with which cinematographer John Seale has invested this movie.

**SURRENDER (PG).** Shrewd, lively but occasionally crass and contrived — romantic comedy starring Sally Field as a struggling artist and Michael Caine as a successful writer, well-burned by women, who skirrhams amusingly as they try to square away love and money. Writer-director Jerry Belson is so honest about relationships if it is shame he did not aim higher, ditching some of the wilder moments. With Steve Guttenberg, terrific as Field's rich, self-absorbed lover.

# Montana novel set for filming

**HELENA, Mont. (AP)** — Actor Robert Redford plans to produce a movie based on the novel "A River Runs Through It," and state officials hope to persuade him to shoot the film in Montana.

Redford is set up to film in Utah, said Garner Gervais, head of Montana's film promotion agency. "We'd like to show him some things he might not realize we have."

"A River Runs Through It," by Norman Maclean, was published in 1976 by the University of Chicago Press. It is the story of a Scottish Presbyterian minister and his family near Wolf Creek.

"Wunderwald said the book has been selected by Redford and Cineplex-Odeon, a California theater chain, as the first in a series of low-budget films they will produce."

Redford said at a news conference in Los Angeles this week that the film would cost less than \$6 million and would begin production this summer.

A spokeswoman at Redford's Wildwood Enterprises in California said Wednesday the company has not decided where the film will be made.

"She said the decision should be made by December."

Wunderwald said he feels neither Maclean would prefer that some of the work be done in Montana. He said Maclean may also have seen the influence over the filming decisions.

**DIRTY DANCING (PG-13).** Smart and funny, touching and unashamedly sentimental, this musical love story set in the Catskills in the early '60s is the sweet sleeper of a hot season. Because director Emile Ardolino comes from a background in dance films (including "Hombre" and "Fever"), he does not — in contrast — seem uncomfortable in the too-easily achieved, instead, the dancing is smart and sympathetic and, as a musical, "Dirty Dancing" is one of the most significant fusions of drama and dance since "Saturday Night Fever," and more involving.

**PRINCE OF DARKNESS (R).** Some graduate students are summoned by their wild-eyed professor (Victor Wong) and a dolorous priest (Donald Pleasence) — to an abandoned church, where they are asked to witness the exorcism of the devil. Trapped in what looks like a green lava lamp — and his minions, which include a gang of homeless zombie derelicts. This absurd premise jumbles up "Night of the Living Dead." "The Omen" and director John Carpenter's best film, "The Thing," to no laudable purpose: carnage and glop interspersed with scientific bibble-babble. But Carpenter directs it very elegantly, and there is one paralyzing shock moment at the end.

**STAKEOUT (R).** The Monty-python-esque high-concept outline of the plot — a detective falls in love with the woman he has under surveil-

# Nelson plays real-life rich yuppie who commits murder for revenge

By PAUL ELIE

Just last April, Joe Hunt, stock trader and leader of a group called the Billionaire Boys Club, was convicted of murdering fellow trader Ron Levin. Hunt and other members of the club still face charges in the murder of Hedayat Eslaminia, a former Iranian government official and the father of a club member. In seemingly record time, there is a miniseries about them, "Billionaire Boys Club," airing Sunday, Nov. 8 and Monday, Nov. 9 on NBC.

By basing "Billionaire Boys Club" on journalist Sue Horton's articles in Los Angeles magazine, NBC has, in effect, accelerated the best seller-to-paperback-to-miniseries pattern.

"It's pretty bold—we're taking some risks just doing it," says Judd Nelson, who stars as Hunt. "I mean, this stuff's happening right now."

Hunt, now 27, was a prep-school graduate and college dropout who took to stock manipulation in order to satisfy a compulsive desire for power. Spotting a need among fellow preppies to top their wealthy parents, he formed the Billionaire Boys Club. Each member headed

his own company, while the group shared capital and profits. Hunt held on to the support of the group throughout a series of power plays culminating in his murder of Levin, a backer who had conned them out of \$4 million.

Because of the Billionaire Boys Club's enforced code of silence and Hunt's irresistible powers of persuasion, the club has been described as a yuppie cult, with Hunt as shaman.

"Why did they listen to him? It wasn't so much his charisma as his incredible skill to listen and discern what was needed," Nelson says. "He'd say to himself, 'This guy needs a father figure,' or 'This guy needs a friend,' or 'This guy needs a confidence builder.' He would say things that they wanted to hear."

It seems inevitable that Nelson, who played a high-school student in "The Breakfast Club" (1985) and a recent college graduate in "St. Elmo's Fire" (1985), would grow up to play a young professional.

"I chose the role for the material, really," he says. "I'd followed the Hunt case in Los Angeles, and then

the part came up. It was like, 'We think you would be perfect to play the yuppie murderer!' I didn't know whether to feel flattered or insulted."

Either way, he must be hoping that the move to TV will boost his sagging career. Before "Billionaire Boys Club," his most recent projects were the dismal feature films "Blue City" and "From the Hip." Nelson and other members of the so-called Brat Pack—Sean Penn, Ally Sheedy, Emilio Estevez, Demi Moore—have found it difficult to distance themselves from young, middle-class roles. But he claims he's not afraid of being typecast.

"If I'm still a 'young actor' when I'm 50, it'll be a problem," he says. "But for now it's no problem."
