Naples car bomb blast kills 5, wounds 17 at USO club

NAPLES, Italy — A car bomb blew up in front of a club for U.S. military personnel in Naples on Thursday, killing a U.S. Navy enlisted woman and four Italians and wounding at least 17, officials said.

There was no immediate claim of responsibility for the blast that happened shortly after 8 p.m. (noon-MDT) at the USO club.

A Pentagon spokeswoman said the American woman was stationed at Naval Communications Area Master Station in Naples. Lt. Janet Mescus, the spokeswoman, said the woman's identity was being withheld pending notification of next of kin.

Mescus identified three of the injured Navy servicemen as Chief Petty Officer Francisco A. Navalta, 39, of the USS Paul, and Petty Officer 3rd Class Craig Lee Trent, 22, and Senior Chief Petty Officer Charles Fifer Roberts, 39; both assigned to the USS Capodanno.

Navalta is from Castillejos, Zamboanga, Philippines. Mescus did not know Navalta's name.

Trent, from Gaithers, Md., was in stable condition, Mescus said.

Roberts, from East St. Louis, Ill., was treated and released.

Italian media quoted officials as saying four Italians were also killed.

One of the bodies at the club's entrance was draped in a U.S. flag. Italian hospital officials said at least four Americans were among the injured.

Lt. David Morris, a Navy spokesman in Naples, said an undetermined number of crewmen from the frigates

USS Capodanno and USS Paul were injured but that no sailor from either ship was killed. He said he did not know if other U.S. military personnel had been killed.

Morris said two sailors from the Capodanno and one from the Paul were

admitted to the U.S. Naval Hospital in Naples. He said one crewman from the Capodanno was treated and returned to his ship.

Italian media said the bomb exploded during a reception at the club

TWIN FALLS — State political figures and labor unions are misleading the public when they say the Special Isotope Separation plant will produce 400 construction jobs, said a Colorado economics professor Thursday.

"They are really talking about people building the shell of a plant. All of the (high technology) equipment will be built out-of-state," said William J. Weida, professor of economics at Colorado College in Colorado Springs.

Jobs, jobs, jobs was a major rallying cry for SIS proponents during the SIS hearings around the state.

A full-page ad in the Idaho Falls Post-Register by the "Yes, Yes, SIS," group said the project would employ 400 people during its construction.

U.S. Department of Energy documents widely distributed to the state's media also refer to a peak of 400 construction jobs.

Weida, a retired Air Force colonel, said energy department documents do show more than 400 construction jobs but in only a one-year period, not 400 jobs during the entire six years.

A spokesman for the company that will operate SIS said it is clear from DOE documents what the SIS construction work force will be.

Jan Hagers of Westinghouse Idaho Nuclear Co. Inc. basically agreed with Weida's statements on the number of construction jobs SIS will produce.

"We have never said 440 construction jobs in five to six years," Hagers said.

Labor officials could not be reached for comment.

The Idaho National Engineering Laboratory, west of Idaho Falls, is the government's preferred site for the plant. SIS will make previously unusable stocks of plutonium suitable for nuclear weapons production.

The Energy Department's Techni-

Jobs at SIS appear to be short-term

Dollar, stocks fall after trade report

WASHINGTON — The monthly U.S. trade deficit widened by more than 11 percent in February to \$13.8 billion, the government said Thursday, sending both stock prices and the dollar nosediving.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average of 30 stocks plummeted 101 points or by about 5 percent and the value of the dollar against the Japanese yen and the German mark dropped about 2 percent on the foreign exchange markets.

Only concerted intervention by the Federal Reserve Bank and central banks in Europe in buying up large volumes of dollars with yen, marks and British pounds prevented the dollar from falling further.

Triggering the turmoil was the Commerce Department's report that the gap between the nation's imports and exports expanded by \$1.4 billion from January's imbalance of \$12.4 bil-

lion. It was the second straight monthly jump in the trade imbalance that had declined in November and December from a record \$17.6 billion deficit last October.

"We've stumbled here a little bit," said Jay Goldinger, an analyst for Capital Insight, an economic consulting firm based in Los Angeles. "It reminds us that we have a major, major problem."

Analysts had largely predicted beforehand that the February deficit would shrink slightly, the normal seasonal pattern for this time of year.

"For the second time in only seven years, there was huge, atypical increase in imports in February, showing that Americans have not lost their appetite for foreign goods," said Allen Sinai, an economist for the Boston Co. of New York.

"It means we have not solved the budget and trade deficit problems,"

Mine damages U.S. frigate, injures 10 men


WASHINGTON — An underwater explosion tore open the hull of an American guided-missile frigate in the central Persian Gulf and injured 10 crewmen Thursday.

Pentagon sources said it appeared the warship hit a mine.

The injured sailors — six with slight burns, one with second-degree burns, one with a hernia and two with back injuries — were evacuated from the USS Samuel B. Roberts, the Defense Department said.

The Roberts then began steaming slowly under its own power toward port in Bahrain.

The sailor with the second-degree burns was flown to Bahrain, the Pentagon said late Thursday. The other nine were transferred to the USS San Jose, a combat stores ship operating

in the central gulf.

Defense sources said the crew of the Roberts had spotted "some mine-like objects" in the water immediately be-

fore the 8:10 a.m. MDT explosion. The Pentagon declined official comment on the report.

The sources, who insisted on ano-

nymity, said the frigate was "making only two knots" on its own power Thursday afternoon and would probably be taken under tow by the cruiser Wainwright.

The Roberts and Wainwright are two of 14 Navy ships assigned to the Persian Gulf force to provide protection to commercial ships flying the American flag. The San Jose was in the area only because it was on a resupply mission.

The Reagan administration increased the U.S. force in the region last summer in response to a request from Kuwait, whose oil tankers come under attack in the course of the Iran-Iraq war.

Dan Howard, the Defense Department's chief spokesman, said the Roberts was in no danger of sinking and that the crew had managed to stop

Engine disintegrates, forcing jet down

CHARLESTON, W.Va. — An engine on a Piedmont jetliner exploded into jagged pieces Thursday, slicing through both sides of the plane and forcing the pilot to make an emergency landing as some passengers screamed and fainted.

Two flight attendants suffered bumps and bruises when the plane carrying 66 passengers plunged after the explosion, Piedmont spokesman Don McGuire said.


Turbine blades ripped through the right rear bathroom and a work area for attendants as the plane crumpled at 31,000 feet.

"If someone had been in the bathroom or the stewardesses' quarters, they would have been killed," said passenger Doug Bruce of Columbus, Ohio. "My first thought was, 'This is it.'"

"It blew a big hole in the plane," said passenger Fred Hinton of Raleigh, N.C. "I'm 240 pounds, and it was big enough that I could crawl through it."

"All the kids were screaming," Hinton said.

Piedmont Flight 486 was flying from Charlotte, N.C., to Columbus, Ohio, when its right jet turbine disintegrated at 7:45 a.m. MDT, Piedmont officials said. The plane, a Fokker F-28, has two engines, one mounted on each side of the cabin.

The plane, 40 miles south of Charleston, immediately lost air pressure in the cabin; several passengers later complained of headaches, earaches and elevated blood pressure.

"It began with a wearing noise and loud vibrations about five or 10 times

straight, and then there was an explosion in the back of us," said passenger Rafael Gonzalez of Charlotte, N.C.

Turbine blades and engine parts ripped through the fuselage, punching holes in both sides of the plane. A hole on the right side, adjacent to the

engine that disintegrated, was 2 feet wide by 6 feet tall. On the opposite side, the hole was 2 feet by 1 foot.

The pilot noticed a fire indicator signal for his No. 2 engine, manufactured by Rolls Royce, and decided to land at Charleston, where he "landed without incident" at Yenger Airport, McGuire said.

Assistant airport manager Dan Hillman said the F-28 was 40 miles south of Charleston and traveling north when the explosion occurred.

The plane made a steep descent after the explosion "but they got it under control. They all did a good job," Hinton said.

A National Transportation Safety Board investigator was dispatched to Charleston to investigate, airport officials said.

Piedmont owns 25 of the German-built F-28 4000s, said another Piedmont spokesman, Bill Kress. Piedmont uses the jets, slightly smaller than Boeing 737s or McDonnell-Douglas DC9s, because many airports in its mountainous region have short runways.

Charleston's airport, named for test pilot Gen. Chuck Yeager, is located atop a mountain 2 miles north of the downtown area.

Immediately after the explosion, oxygen masks dropped from the ceiling and flight attendants and adult passengers went through the aisles and assisted children, passengers said.

Peaceful pullout unlikely for Soviets

GENEVA — The Soviet Union signed a formal pledge Thursday to withdraw its troops from Afghanistan starting May 15, but there was no indication from guerrillas that the Red Army will be allowed to "leave peacefully" after eight years of war.

Muslim insurgent leaders, who were not invited to the negotiations, said they would present their reaction Saturday at a rally in Pakistan.

"The U.S.-supported guerrillas, who claim to control virtually all the country except the cities, are expected to repeat their vow to continue fighting until the last Soviet soldier has left Afghan soil."

The United States, the Soviet Union, Afghanistan and neighboring Pakistan, signed the accord Thursday in an austere 10-minute ceremony. It stipulates that the withdrawal begin May 15.

Provisions of the agreement require the two countries to stop interfering in one another's affairs. The insurgents, who have been fighting since a Communist coup in April 1978, are based in camps and

cities on Pakistan's side of the border.

About 3.6 million Afghan refugees live in Pakistan and another 1.6 million in Iran, together representing about one-third of Afghanistan's population. Those in Iran are not covered by the agreement's provisions on return of refugees.

The pact was worked out in indirect talks between Pakistan and Afghanistan that began in 1982 and were mediated by the United Nations. Soviet soldiers entered Afghanistan in December 1979 and an estimated 115,000 are there helping fight the insurgents.

About 100 opponents of the accord held an hour-long demonstration outside the U.N. headquarters building before the signing ceremony Thursday afternoon.

Those signing the "Occupant" were Secretary of State George P. Shultz, Foreign Minister Eduard A. Shevardnadze of the Soviet Union, Afghan Foreign Minister Abdul Wakil and Pakistan's acting foreign minister, Zain Raza.

Shevardnadze told reporters the accord "totally blocked" the "entire range" of interference in Afghan affairs.

Idaho mayor given liberation medal

WASHINGTON — Private first class (ret.) Ray Stone sat in exalted company Thursday with a lieutenant general, the deputy secretary of state, an ambassador, and other dignitaries.

But when Stone, now mayor of Coeur d'Alene, accepted the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Council's Eisenhower Liberation Medal for his crusade against a neo-fascist group and for his role in liberating a Nazi death camp, he said he wished all combat veterans in the 82nd Airborne that he served with in World War II could have been with him on the podium.

"Even though I am the recipient of this award, I can only accept it in the name of all the soldiers in the 82nd Airborne," Stone told the 800 people gathered in the State Department auditorium Thursday.

The Eisenhower Liberation Medal is awarded annually by the Council to individuals who played a role in the liberation of the Nazi concentration camps. In 1945 Stone, an Army private, helped liberate the Weissenhof concentration camp in Germany.

"The experience shaped my life," Stone said in a press interview after the ceremony. "No words I can ever say could express what it was like. It was a horrifying experience. Why would people treat other people like that?"

The Holocaust Memorial Council also gave Stone a certificate of ap-

preciation made out to the citizens of Coeur d'Alene.

"This moment of great pride is theirs and theirs alone," Stone said. "As mayor, I feel blessed to represent such decent and good people."

The neo-Nazi Arvan Nations, founded by the Rev. Richard Butler, arrived in Coeur d'Alene in 1972, according to Larry Broad-bent, Coeur d'Alene's deputy sheriff. Butler built a compound about 18 miles north of the town and began preaching sermons extolling racial hatred and armed resistance in his Church of Jesus Christ Christians.

When the hate group was introduced to northern Idaho, Broad-bent and Dana Wezel, city administrator, spurred the Kootenai County Task Force on Human Relations into action. Together with others, they mobilized public support for the task force and eventually were successful in helping enact state laws providing stiff punishment for racially or religiously-inspired crimes.

In awarding the medal to Stone, Council vice chairman William J. Lowenberg said, "Mr. Stone says he was not a hero. He was just there. But being there has made Raymond Stone a hero to us." Also awarded an Eisenhower Liberation Medal in the hour-long ceremony was Lt. Gen. James M. Gavin, who commanded the 82nd Airborne in WWII.

Hansen hints he won't try for Congress

BOISE (AP) — Although it's an attractive idea, former Idaho congressman George Hansen says he probably won't make another bid for the seat he held for seven terms.

The filing deadline for Idaho candidates is Friday at 6 p.m. Although he wouldn't flatly say he won't file, Hansen said his "Free America" project, geared toward electing a conservative majority to Congress, "is bigger than one seat."

Democrat Rep. Richard Stallings defeated Hansen in 1984 by 170 votes, then won re-election two years ago. Hansen's wife, Connie, ran in the GOP primary, but did not win the nomination to face Stallings.

Running against Richard Stallings would make it practically impossible to spearhead the national effort, Hansen said. "Although it was a pleasure to represent Idaho, I would hate to interrupt that," he said.

Former state senator Dane Watkins of Idaho Falls filed his petitions on Wednesday for the GOP nomination and Stallings has announced his bid for a third term from the 2nd district.

One congressional candidate who did file Thursday at the secretary of state's office here was David W. Shepherd, Lewisiston, seeking the Democratic 1st District congressional seat. Shepherd ran as an independent in the 1986 race, but drew only 5,634 votes to 121,274 for the winner, Republican Rep. Larry Craig. Democrat Bill Currie trailed Craig with 59,133 votes.

Already in the race is Bruce Robinson, Bonners Ferry lawyer, and state Rep. Jeanne Givens, D-Coeur d'Alene, has announced for the Democrat nomination but hadn't filed nominating petitions as of Thursday afternoon. Craig is seeking his fifth term.

In 1986, more than 250 candidates filed for 126 legislative seats. As of mid-afternoon Thursday, 151 candidates had filed.

Power council tries to protect wildlife

MISSOULA, Mont. (AP) — An interstate council recommended Thursday that 40,000 miles of waterways in the Pacific Northwest — about 15 percent of all streams in the region — be declared off-limits for new hydroelectric dams to protect fish and wildlife habitat.

The Northwest Power Planning Council, created by Congress to guide energy planning in the region while preserving the region's wildlife resources, voted 7-0 on Thursday to submit the proposal as an amendment to its Columbia River Basin Fish and Wildlife Program.

The proposal would be subject to public hearings in the four states affected — Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana.

But if finally adopted, the proposal would have a significant impact on power development in the region.

The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, which licenses non-federal dams, is required by law to follow the council's guidance "to the fullest extent practicable."

And the Bonneville Power Administration would be barred from buying power from dams sited in violation of the policy or allowing their electricity into the BPA power grid, necessary for interstate sales.

"The council's judgment was that new projects in critical areas involved unacceptable risks to fish and wildlife habitat," said Daley Mahar, the council's public information director.

"We also see this action as protecting the ratepayer investment," he added. "Ratepayers have spent thousands of dollars to rebuild salmon and steelhead fisheries, and it doesn't

make sense to start new projects which kill new species."

The council's action followed a lengthy debate over how to protect critical fish and wildlife habitat in the region from the encroachments of still more hydroelectric dams.

The consensus for a total ban built during testimony Wednesday, and environmental groups saw the final decision as a major victory for conservationists. A representative of Friends of the Earth called the move "awesome."

Mahar said the final debate came down to a choice between a total prohibition on dam building on critical streams and a so-called "no harm" provision that would ban dams unless the builder demonstrated it would not harm fish or wildlife. The latter proposal met strong opposition from most on the council.

"To do something less than to protect to the greatest extent we find consistent with our authority ... is to abdicate," said George Turman, a Montana representative.

The Idaho contingent initially favored the so-called "no-harm" option, with member James Goller saying that prohibiting dams "will set the stage for a lot of divisiveness in the region."

In the end, however, Idaho ended up voting for the ban.

The 40,000 miles of Pacific Northwest waterways affected were selected by wildlife managers in each of the four states after a review of some 180,000 miles of undammed waterways.

Symms launches drive against INF approval

WASHINGTON — Employing the potent political symbol of an umbrella, Sen. Steve Symms, R-Idaho, on Thursday helped kick off a campaign to rally U.S. support against the proposed Intermediate Nuclear Forces Treaty.

At a press conference with Conservative Caucus chairman Howard Phillips and Sen. Gordon Humphrey, R-N.H., Symms said "overwhelming Senate support for the treaty was a result of the 'feel good' politics that eventually will prove detrimental to the country."

The umbrella will be used in the national campaign as a dual emblem; they said will be appropriate for the upcoming Senate debate of the treaty.

"Open," Phillips said he wrote to the 100 U.S. senators, "the umbrella signifies the protective shield which, for more than four decades, has prevented Soviet dominance and intimidation of Western Europe. Closed, the umbrella today symbolizes the spirit of appeasement and the lack of resolve which characterized Neville Chamberlain's dealings with Adolph Hitler at Munich precisely 50 years ago."

Umbrellas were delivered to the offices of the U.S. senators.

Symms, who is against recommending the Senate approve the treaty in the Armed Services Committee, reiterated his complaint that the Soviets were not to be trusted.

"It is in their interest to lie, cheat, deceive and intimidate the West with those weapons," Symms said. He said that Soviet proclivity toward cheating makes the treaty virtually unverifiable. He even suggested that the Soviets may be keeping a secret stock of SS-20 missiles aimed at Europe, although no evidence of such a stock has ever been revealed.

Humphrey admitted he and Symms were in a minority in the Senate. Most other conservative senators have dropped their reservations in the treaty and most observers expect the treaty will pass the Senate either late this spring or in the summer.

Slaying role nets 5-year prison term

BOISE (AP) — Daron Cox, 31, on Thursday was ordered to serve up to five years in prison for his part in the dismembered slaying of a Boise man last July.

Fourth District Judge George Carey pronounced sentence after Cox pleaded guilty to being an accessory to murder and aggravated assault.


Cox was ordered to serve five years on the accessory charge and two years for assault, but Carey said the sen-

tences will run at the same time. Cox was given credit for time served, which court officials said would make him eligible for parole in 120 days.

Cox and Daniel Rodgers of Boise were arrested last year and charged with the slaying of Preston Murr in July. The man's dismembered body was found in the Snake River near Weiser.

Rodgers was convicted of murder and awaits sentencing.

Patent for mouse the right decision

The U.S. Patent Office has made the right decision in granting a patent for a genetically engineered mouse, the first animal ever patented.

The action is consistent with the history of patent decisions in this area and with proper and informed public policy. The mouse, which was invented by scientists at Harvard University, will be an aid to cancer research. Of course the government should assist such work.


In objecting to the patent, some members of Congress and other well-intentioned critics worry about the notoriety and morality of granting a patent on a new form of life. The Harvard mouse is the first "higher organism" for which a patent has been granted, though the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in 1980 that a patent could be granted to a new microorganism. The court said that living things could be patented.

But the fears over genetic engineering, which were appropriate at the start of this technology nearly two decades ago, have not entirely abated, although there is no evidence that there is anything to fear. People talk about the dangers of creating new forms of life, but there is no reason to suspect that the genetic invention of a mouse that is likely to get cancer has anything to do with the genetic experiments of science-fiction stories. This is serious and important biomedical research; not the work of mad scientists.

The co-inventor of the mouse, Dr. Philip Leder, a Harvard geneticist, is a dedicated cancer researcher who is trying to understand the role of genes in the development of cancer. His work should be applauded and encouraged.

The patent office has before it 21 other applications for patents on genetically engineered animals. If they meet the other criteria for patentability, patents should be granted for them as well. Congress should not succumb to groundless fears and interfere with these patents.

Tax act biggest misnomer of them all

BOSTON — When they write the linguistic history of the 1980s — commemorating all those wonderful phrases like "Peacekeeper" and "Star Wars" — I hope they give due notice to the greatest misnomer of them all: The Tax Simplification Act.

Yes, Tax Simplification. This was the pristine notion that the government could not only lower taxes but also lower the threshold of confusion and mathphobia among taxpayers.

In the greatest switch-and-bait operation of the period, we bought simplification. But what did we receive? Exactly 48 new tax forms, 2,704 changes in the code, and a 48-page instruction booklet that reads like an English translation of a manual for operating a Japanese computer program.

In its first year, tax reform may have resulted in the largest transfer of income in the century. Any money that might have been retrieved from the government's coffers went directly to the accountants.

But this is not another mid-April diatribe against the government. I am convinced that sim-

plification was doomed from the start. When, after all, was the last time anything in your life was actually simplified?

Consider the equipment you deal with every day: the dashboard of your car, the instruction panel of the VCR. Consider the day itself, the increasing variety of things that are inscribed in your minute-at-a-glance book?

The direction of contemporary American life is relentlessly moving from generalist to specialist, from simple to complex. We no longer have one doctor's name; we have an entire list, each corresponding to a different part of our anatomy. We no longer work, eat, sleep and take care of our families in one location; we spend our lives commuting

along some personal assembly line, from home to school to work to shop.

The tax system is nothing more or less than a metaphor for this technological and personal scattering. The forms that have proliferated are a reflection of the increase in the number of things we are supposed to know about. There's just too much information. And the IRS wants it all.

Jeremy Rifkin; a man of maverick intelligence at the Foundation on Economic Trends, has thought a good deal about the fragmented society. He says: "The IRS deals with individuals as a productive unit. But that unit is increasingly Balkanized, divided, subverted."

In the past, the average American "productive unit" generally had one source of income and worked in one location, had one pension at best, one bank account, no mortgage and no credit card. Now in accordance with time and trends, we have many of the above, each with a form to fill out.

The person with a computer at home can work at home and deduct at home. And then prove it to the IRS. The bank that offers more credit options than the airlines offer fares will give you a home-equity loan. In return the IRS will hand you the science-fiction creature of the new tax laws, Form 8598. MIT graduates have swaged when confronted by it.

As for retirement income, it now comes in ruffe flavors than ice cream, from IRAs to Social Security to military and company pensions. Each has its own meaning and calculations to its own "productive unit" and that productive unit-watcher, the tax man.

It's just our professional lives that have divided into the sum of their tax-relevant areas; so have our personal lives. Any number of fractured families spend April playing the game called "Who Gets the Kids as a Tax Deduction?"

"It's a mess," says Rifkin, who relates it to the decline and fall of everybody's favorite empire. "When Rome got too complex in all its interactions, we got the Middle Ages with the major system."

That sort of nostalgia won't get you a tax-filing extension until the barbarians are at the gate. The reality is that taxes imitate life. This is the time of year that the IRS takes stock of our lives. The tool for the job is that wonder of the era, The Tax Complication Act.

Nice to know the answers are close by

Interested parties may recall an incident of a few years ago when a Polish citizen of Jewish ancestry applied for emigration to Israel.

In ordinary circumstances, such an application would have been routinely approved, since Israeli law guarantees sanctuary for any Jew anytime or anyplace.

This case, however, presented unusual problems, in that the petitioner was a Catholic priest. So the question arose, "Exactly what is a Jew?" Is the form used to designate religious affiliation or ethnic origin? This particular individual had been born to Jewish parents, orphaned, adopted and reared Catholic and eventually entered the priesthood.

To this day the question has not been resolved to the satisfaction of all elements in Israeli society.

The various historians, theological scholars and government officials who have long grappled with this problem could have utilized the expertise of Henry Aschenbrenner of Rupert, who on March 24, 1988, clarified the issue once and for all.

Aschenbrenner advises that the appellation applies only to those people who were members of the tribe of Judah. As for the other 11 (sometimes 12) tribes, it is unclear exactly what they were —

Canaanites perhaps, or just plain Hebrews, or possibly Morreses; but certainly not Jews. Many of us are grateful to Aschenbrenner for his precise definition.

All things considered, it's been an extremely educational month. Not only was the aforementioned question settled conclusively, but Dennis Petersen, in his stunning presentation at CSI, managed to unlock the mysteries of creation, just as advertised.

Petersen's single most notable accomplishment during this seminar was also of a semantic nature, in that he gave us an accurate definition of the word "world." "World," is synonymous with "earth."

Panel investigates Meese connections

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal grand jury on Thursday questioned two members of the Bender family which arranged to pay the wife of Attorney General Edwin Meese III while leasing office space to the Justice Department.

The panel, under the direction of independent counsel James McKay, is investigating whether Meese has violated federal law through any conflict between his personal financial interests and his government duties.

Accompanied by their attorney, Seymour Glazer, Howard M. Bender and his wife, Sandra, arrived at the grand jury Thursday morning. He spent more than three hours behind closed doors. Later, Mrs. Bender was questioned separately for about an hour.

Meanwhile, trustees of the Multiple Sclerosis Society said Thursday that they never voted on the plan to hire Ursula Meese at \$40,000 a year with money do-

nated by the Bender family foundation.

The Associated Press reported Wednesday that a partnership headed by Howard Bender won a \$50-million lease on Justice Department offices after the Bender Foundation put up money to pay Mrs. Meese's salary at the MS society.

Meese, in Atlanta to attend a drug conference, was asked by a reporter about the matter but declined to comment. During a stop later at an Immigration and Naturalization Service center in Decatur, Ga., he turned aside several questions about the lease arrangement, saying "that's not on the subject of immigration."

White House spokesman Martin Fitzwater said Thursday that he knew nothing about the lease but that President Reagan "still has full confidence in Ed Meese."

Senate gives OK to \$1.1 trillion budget

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate on Thursday approved a \$1.1 trillion budget that calls for bypassing last fall's deficit-reduction pact with President Reagan to expand the war on drugs.

The fiscal 1989 spending blueprint, passed 69-26, also includes increases for education, the space program and AIDS research while freezing or cutting back transportation, housing and development.

"We made tough choices," said Sen. Lawton Chiles, D-Fla., chairman of the Budget Committee. He defended his plan while conceding that the deficit problem remains "unsolved. "We can't keep consuming more than we earn and living on credit," he said.

Sen. J. James Easton, D-Neb., called the budget a "lost opportunity" that resulted from "a decision to coast rather than deal with the deficit" in an election year.

The next president and the next Congress will be left with enormous problems," he said.

The House approved a different version of the spending plan last month. The two chambers will begin negotiations next week toward a final budget resolution.

Conforming with last fall's deficit-reduction agreement with the president, the Senate plan earmarks \$294 billion for military spending and

\$16.1 billion for international assistance. It includes no new taxes beyond the \$14 billion enacted last December for fiscal 1989, which begins Oct. 1.

The amendment offered by Sens. Dennis DeConcini, D-Ariz., and Alfonso D'Amato, R-N.Y., called for increasing government tax and debt collections to cover the \$1.4 billion that would be spent by the end of fiscal 1989.

'Tax Freedom Day' for 1988 is latest ever

WASHINGTON (AP) — The "average" American will have to work 126 days this year — two more than in 1987 — just to pay federal, state and local taxes, the Tax Foundation said Thursday. "Tax Freedom Day" will fall on May 5, the latest ever.

The best taxpayers have fared in the past decade was in 1984 — when most of the big 1981 federal income-tax reduction had taken effect — when Tax Freedom Day fell on April 28, "economists for the foundation said.

But federal tax increases enacted in 1982, 1984 and 1987 "have lopped off big chunks of the '81 cuts, and Social Security hikes have made further inroads until, like the Cheshire Cat in 'Alice in Wonderland,' nothing remains but the smile," the foundation said.

Last year, the big day was May 4; this year's May 5 date is two days later because 1988 is a leap year,

which meant there was a Feb. 29 this year.

With the approach of the Friday midnight deadline for filing federal tax returns — the first under the heavily revised tax law — there were these other tax developments:

The Internal Revenue Service, whose telephone "assistants" have been giving the wrong answer to about 28 of every 100 tax questions this year, disclosed some factors it will consider in determining whether to waive certain penalties for taxpayers who follow such bad advice.

The agency said penalties for late filing, negligence and failure to pay can be waived if the taxpayers prove he or she acted reasonably.

Bahamas won't face sanctions over drugs

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate refused Thursday to impose sanctions on the Bahamas for failing to do enough in the war on drugs, and took up similar legislation that would penalize Mexico.

The lawmakers voted 54 to 40 against a resolution to penalize the Bahamas after vehement protests that the islands are cooperating with U.S. drug interdiction officials and that backers of the sanctions were jeopardizing bilateral relations in response to election-year political pressure.

"It's a great opportunity to show them we're tough, show them who's boss, and that we're against drugs," said Sen. John Chafee, R-R.I. But he noted that the Bahamian government

has won praise from drug authorities for its cooperation. Penalizing the islands "just doesn't make much sense," he said.

Under a 1986 law, countries identified as production or transit points for illegal drugs must lose half their U.S. foreign aid unless the president certifies that they are "fully cooperating" with the war on drugs.

President Reagan made such a certification on March 1 for 17 of the 24 countries on the drug-trafficking list, including the Bahamas and Mexico.

While neither country receives substantial U.S. economic aid, losing the administration's drug certification could lead to loss of other benefits, including lucrative sugar-import quotas, airline landing rights and trade preferences.

Dollar's dive creates turmoil

WASHINGTON (AP) — The dollar plunged on world currency markets Thursday in reaction to bad news on the U.S. trade deficit despite a massive coordinated effort on the part of the United States and its economic allies to halt the slide.

The dollar's steep dive served as an ominous reminder to the world's economic powers that their best-laid plans to steady the global economy can be quickly disrupted by events.

Just as it had done several times last year, the weakness in the dollar quickly spread to other financial markets, sending interest rates up sharply and pushing the Dow Jones industrial average down by more than 100 points, its second three-digit loss this year.

The market turmoil came only a day after the world's seven major industrial countries had issued a glowing communiqué bragging about their ability to hold the dollar stable for the past four months.

Finance ministers and central bank presidents of the seven nations — the United States, Japan, West Germany, Britain, France and Italy — reaffirmed on Wednesday their commitment to keep the dollar stable.

They pledged to back up the commitment with coordinated intervention, the process by which governments dump other currencies in exchange for dollars as a way of supporting the greenback.

Moscow media laud accords, skip troop withdrawal

MOSCOW (AP) Soviet media on Thursday called the Afghanistan accord in Geneva "the news we've been waiting so long for," but there was only sketchy mention of the Kremlin's commitment to bring its soldiers home.

Radio Moscow used only one sentence to sum up the consequences of the pact for the estimated 115,000 Soviet troops deployed in Afghanistan.

"It was agreed that the withdrawal of Soviet troops is to start on May 15, and to be completed within nine months," it said.

Other media reports, including state-run television's top evening news broadcast, made no reference to the pullout at all.

Instead, most emphasized that the goal of the pact is the peaceful settlement of Afghanistan's 10-year-old civil war, and reiterated Soviet backing for the embattled Marxist government of President Najib.

Most Soviets, however, would be aware of the implications of the accords.

Communist Party chief Mikhail S. Gorbachev said last week that the pullout would begin in mid-May if the U.N. brokered Geneva negotiations were successful.

Soviet leader Leonid I. Brezhnev sent troops into Afghanistan on Dec. 27, 1979, to preside over the replacement of one Marxist leader by another. They stayed on to help combat a nationwide insurgency in a military operation now in its ninth year that has cost thousands of Soviet lives and billions of rubles, sparked domestic dissent, and poisoned the Kremlin's relations with other Muslim and Third World nations.


Gorbachev called it the nation's "bleeding wound" and human rights activist Andrei D. Sakharov branded it "one of the great tragedies of our times."

From the U.S. withdrawal of the SALT II arms control treaty and the boycott of the 1980 Moscow Olympics by the United States and 61 other nations to the canceling of grain and other trade agreements involving foreign suppliers, the Soviets paid the price for sending tanks and troops across the Afghan border.

The U.S. State Department has estimated Soviet casualties since 1979 at 33,000-38,000, more than one-third of whom were killed. Those figures do not include "heavy losses" to disease, the department said in a report issued in December.

A Moscow newspaper editor recently

told a Western reporter of receiving a letter from a man whose only son was killed in Afghanistan. "Now the others are coming home," the writer of the letter said. "But what did my boy die for?"

Unrest claims 2 lives

JERUSALEM (AP) — Soldiers shot two Arabs dead Thursday and wounded four, including a child who lost an eye, and a 12-year-old Palestinian wrote a letter to a Jewish boy saying the violence kills "innocents like me and you."
A strike called by the PLO to protest mass arrests of Arabs virtually shut down the occupied West Bank and east Jerusalem, but some Palestinians have begun complaining about the economic pinch caused by repeated strikes.

At least 146 Palestinians have been killed since riots began Dec. 8 in the occupied West Bank and Gaza Strip, according to U.N. figures, and hundreds have been wounded. An Israeli soldier and a 15-year-old Jewish settler also have been slain.

U.N. officials in Vienna accused Israeli soldiers of using tear gas improperly, sometimes causing deadly effects, by using tear gas canisters into small, enclosed areas, and also indicated Israel might be using another form of toxic gas. The army denied the allegations.

Hospital officials said a 70-year-old Arab woman suffocated on Wednesday after soldiers threw a tear gas canister into her home. The army said she died of natural causes.

Salem Ismail Obediat, who is 12 and lives in an Arab neighborhood of Jerusalem, wrote to the Arabic-language daily *Al-Nahar* in response to a note it published Wednesday from Lior Kay of Tel Aviv. The 13-year-old Jewish boy had said he wanted to start a dialogue with Arab children.

Obediat is the reason for our suffering, Lior, Salem's letter said.

Nicaraguan, Contra heads renew talks

MANAGUA, Nicaragua (AP) — Government and Contra leaders today agreed to renew technical talks on implementing a cease-fire and to start high-level negotiations to end the six-year civil war.

The stalled cease-fire technical talks were to start immediately in the southern border post of Sapoa, site of earlier negotiations. The high-level talks were to start in Managua on Friday.

A government delegation traveled to Sapoa almost immediately after the agreement was announced at noon by the Contras and Manuel Espinoza, information minister for the leftist Sandinista government.

The Sandinistas backed off from their demand that the technical talks be held in Managua and agreed to a Contra request that they be in Sapoa. In exchange, the Contras stopped insisting that Friday's political talks begin only if the Sapoa talks were successful.

The Contras agreed that if the talks are not finished today, they'll conclude in Managua. Espinoza told a group of Associated Press in a telephone interview.

Earlier Thursday, Contra representatives Roberto Ferrey and David Stadthagen flew into the capital's Sandino airport in a private aircraft and were met by





State toughens waste rules; businesses cautious

TWIN FALLS - The state is adopting new, tougher rules affecting businesses that store hazardous waste above or below ground.

But some area companies are so wary of getting involved with hazardous waste storage, that they are avoiding it like the plague.

"I don't want to touch it with a 10-foot pole," said Dave Davidson of the Idaho Grange Co. in Shoshone.

The company sells agricultural chemicals, and Davidson said he has instructed his drivers to apply all the chemicals in the tank and not bring any back.

"We don't want to cross over and get our

fingers burned," he said.

Bonanza Motors in Burley is also trying to avoid getting into a hazardous waste storage situation.

The company does not store its waste solvents, but it is too risky, we are too close to the river," said Larry Dessel, service manager.

A company picks up Bonanza's waste solvents every three weeks, he said.

As the amount of hazardous waste stored increases, the rules become stricter, said Dr. J. K. regulatory analyst, state Division of Environmental Quality.

The new state rules actually incorporate federal rules about storage tank of hazardous waste.

The new rules require leak detection systems in case hazardous waste tanks

leak, he said.

Hazardous waste includes solvents such as trichloroethylene that are used to clean machinery. They can be produced by every one from the local dry cleaner to an auto service shop or a printing operation.

"The new rules also require liners around waste storage tanks to prevent the hazardous waste from seeping into the ground.

The PureGro Co. in Kimberly deals in agricultural chemicals and feed and does not have hazardous waste storage," said John Swan, manager.

But when some chemicals spill at PureGro, they become hazardous waste. Such was the case in February when phosphoric acid spilled.

PureGro is putting a concrete retaining

well around its tank farm to contain any future spill, Swan said.

Federal hazardous waste rules already apply here. By the state adopting the new federal rules, the state can take enforcement actions without going to the federal government," said Koch of environmental quality.

Later this year the state will hold workshops in Twin Falls and other locations throughout the state to explain the new hazardous waste rules and the existing ones, Koch said.

The rules change every year and may change even more often in the future, he said.

Different rules apply depending on the amount of hazardous waste a company produces.

Those generating less than 220 pounds of hazardous waste per month receive a conditional exemption, Koch said. Someone in this category might be the local dry cleaner.

Those who produce more than 220 pounds per month, up to 2,200 pounds, have stricter requirements in accounting for the waste and can't dispose of the waste in a landfill, he said.

When the amount of waste produced monthly tops 2,200 pounds, the producer has even stricter rules to contend with, Koch said.

Brochures on the hazardous waste rules can be obtained through the state Division of Environmental Quality. The address for this agency is 450 W. State St., Boise 83720.

Voters approve Blaine override

HAILEY - Blaine County voters approved a two-year, \$1.6 million override levy by a vote of 883-594 Thursday, said Superintendent David Noonan.

Only a simple majority was needed, but voters approved it by a 60 percent majority.

"Last year the levy carried by the largest plurality ever with 63 percent, so we're very pleased with the 60 percent passage. This is the first year we've had a two-year levy," Noonan said.

The levy was approved by the majority of voters in Sun Valley, Ketchum, Hailey and Carey, but not in Bellevue. The district has traditionally not had support for override levies there, Noonan said.

The levy will make up a quarter of the district's operating budget

for each of the next two years. School officials plan to spend \$1.3 next year and \$1.9 the succeeding year. The two-year tax hike translates into about \$66 in property taxes a year on a \$50,000 home.

The money, Noonan said, is critical to underwriting regular day-to-day expenses of the district. Without it 25 percent of the staff would have to be laid off, he said, meaning severely overcrowded classrooms.

But while the override amount was among the highest being sought by any district in the state, Trustee Peter Flood called it inadequate, particularly for a district that has seen its allotment from the state frozen two straight years because of a change in the distribution formula.

"The fact is the board has been holding to the \$1.6 million the last

Felton to inspect all 42 county jails

TWIN FALLS - Twin Falls County Commission Chairman Judy Felton, who announced earlier this year she won't run for re-election, is already moving into other endeavors.

Felton has accepted a \$1,700-a-month, four-month position with the Idaho Sheriff's Association. She will be in charge of inspecting Idaho's 42 county jails, a project lasting from May until September.

She estimates the inspections will take 16 days during the May to September period. During those 16 days and any other county time she has to spend on paperwork, she will ask the county not to pay her.

Felton, who asked for an attorney general's opinion on whether

the position would pose a conflict of interest, will be taking an unpaid leave of absence from the county on those specific days she is inspecting jails or doing other work for the association, she said.


"It just seemed to fall in line with the things I've been doing here in the county," Felton said.

During her years in office as Twin Falls county commissioner, Felton presided over both unsuccessful and successful jail bond elections.

She also helped implement an expensive agreement to settle a lawsuit filed over jail conditions after the 1985 jail bond election failed and was behind a second, successful jail bond election.

Now, she will be in charge of the effort to evaluate and grade all of

Jerome dairy controversy returns

JEROME - A group of neighbors angry over a dairy being built near their country homes will get another chance to voice their complaints and possibly stop the construction of the 600-hu dairy.

The Jerome County and a group of citizens who sued over the approval of the dairy agreed earlier this week to send the case back to square one.

"This just gives everybody a chance to start it over again," said Jerome County Prosecutor John Horgan.

A group of about 20 residents sued the Jerome County Commission when it approved

a special-use permit for the Kenneth Vanderham dairy after the commission's own planning and zoning board recommended denial.

The commission approved the permit last August over the objections of several neighbors, including residents of the adjacent Leisure Acres subdivision.

But Vanderham, a dairy farmer from Ontario, Calif., is close to completing construction on the dairy and at least one neighbor is frustrated with the fight.

"I'm somewhat upset with the whole situation," said Larry Berg. "They seem like they're full of delay tactics."

Complaints about groundwater pollution, odors and flies permeated the Aug. 4, 1987, hearing before the commissioners. But a

stipulation Horgan and dairy neighbor attorney E. Len Schlender signed sent the case back on a sticky legal point in county zoning ordinance.

Those ordinances say no dairy can be built within 1,000 feet of a residential home.

"From our measurements there are at least eight primary residences that have been there for 20 years or more within 1,000 feet of the dairy," Schlender said.

Horgan said the county developed no evidence on how close the dairy will be to residential homes during its hearings.

"We just don't have any evidence on this one," he said, and Schlender agreed a judge

McClure urges funding for projects

WASHINGTON, April 14 - Today's congressional report on the state of the economy says the law, so federal agencies ought to follow Congress' informal recommendations before it is ordered to do so, said Sen. James McClure, R-Id.

McClure's advice was delivered in response to the Reagan administration's continuing effort to curb the "work" it said is contained in the megaspending bill approved by Congress last December that funds the government this fiscal year.

At issue in McClure's latest bid to keep on track funding for Northwest projects is the planned \$8.7 million Army Corps of Engineers project to make fish-bypass improvements at five dams on the Lower Snake and Columbia River Basin.

The Office of Management and Budget has balked at releasing all the money for the work. Another 245 other small and large federal projects nationwide that are ordered in the \$600 billion Continuing Appropriations legislation

have been targeted for reduction or termination by OMB.

At the moment, OMB, the super executive agency responsible for administering the administration's "stand on firm" budget in withholding some of the project money because the Corps was not explicitly directed to perform the work. Instead, the work was requested in an unofficial Senate Appropriations Committee report detailing Congress' wish list.

Rather than obey Congress' directive, OMB Director James Miller told the senators he authorized the Corps only to spend \$3 million to purchase two barges for downstream transportation, McClure said.

Also, Miller ordered \$1 million "to develop a long-range plan to address fish-bypass issues in the Columbia River Basin. Further funding for the program during this fiscal year, the director said in a letter to the Corps, will be dependent upon the development of a suitable long-range program."

If OMB continues to withhold the money, Congress can't and has in similar circum-

stances in the past - turn the "report language" into law, whereupon all questions about the project's funding will cease.

"This would make for very cumbersome legislation, and we hope such a step will not be necessary," McClure said in a prepared statement.

In response to Miller's comments about the Lower Snake and Columbia river projects, McClure, as well as Sen. Mark Hatfield, R-Ore., said, "What you do not understand, or fail to recognize, is that the entire \$8.7 million provided in FY 89 and all future funding for the Columbia-Snake fish bypass program will be financed from regional electric rates."

According to the two senators, the Corps constructs, operates and maintains the facilities with appropriated funds. The funding for these improvements will be fully repaid with interest by the region's taxpayers, they said.

Without the fish bypass program, McClure and Hatfield said, "The U.S. government will spend millions of dollars each year to improve the fish habitat on the South Fork of the

Chatburn favors Redman against Callen and Robbins

TWIN FALLS - Former lawmaker Vard Chatburn on Thursday endorsed Odeen Redman, the darkhorse running in the Republican primary against Reps. Jerry Callen and G. Robbins in the Democratic primary.

"I think he will effectively represent all the constituents in the Magic Valley," said Chatburn, who retired in 1986 as a 30-year veteran of the Legislature from Cassia County.

Chatburn's support increased Redman's lead in the second round of the eight-county district that the Alliance

seeks to represent.

It also contrasts Republican support in the race, where party affiliation is drawing increased attention. After Robbins labeled Callen an unthinking ultra-conservative, Callen criticized Robbins for siding with Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus on several issues. He also said he considered Redman a Democrat.

Callen, of Jerome; Robbins, of Dietrich; and Redman are each seeking the Republican nomination for the seat Callen now holds. The primary is May 24.

Redman responded Thursday that he favors a mix of moderation and conservatism between Callen, whom he con-

siders more conservative, and Robbins, whom he considers more liberal.

But muddying the political waters is Redman's background, having once run as a Democrat for the Cassia County Commission.

"Somebody asked me (in 1984) to run against an incumbent Republican after the primary," Redman said. "Being young and foolish, I decided to do that," he said, recalling that he lost badly.

But the 50-year-old said his Republican support predates even that early foray into politics. He said he began signing petitions for Chatburn in 1986.

"I think that demonstrates that I've

supported Republicans for many years," Redman said.

Still, his background helped direct Redman's campaign toward Callen's financial seat, rather than closer to home against one of the four lawmakers representing Cassia, Jerome and Minidoka counties.

He said challenging a Cassia County incumbent may have been regarded as anti-Republican.

"I want people to know I am going to work for the Republican party with less or draw," Redman said.

Toward that winning goal, Chatburn endorsed Redman.

"I have nothing at all against Jerry

Callen and Gary Robbins in any way, shape or form," Chatburn said. "But there's always a place for new people to get into politics."

Chatburn said that Redman, as president and general manager of the independent Albion Telephone Co., has a good business background. That is complemented by Redman's familiarity with agriculture by helping Chatburn with his branding each year.

"I think every candidate is going to be positive practically the same," Chatburn said. "It's going to be that much to the individual and his personality."

Twin Falls police will observe towing policy

Residents, friends of Atlanta fill some holes on bad road

BOISE (AP) — Nearly 30 residents and friends of Atlanta, tired of watching their vehicles rattle into disrepair on the road to the historic mining town, have held a pothole party.

From Arrowrock Dam to Atlanta, the town's only year-round access to the outside world has had no maintenance for a year. Two counties and the Forest Service refuse to recognize the road as theirs.

"They don't want it. Nobody wants it," Mountain Home Highway District Commissioner Bill Robins said.

As a result, the dirt road has deteriorated into washboard and craters.

Large rocks have rolled down onto the road.

"It's a torture test for your vehicle," said Jim Sayko, who closed Atlanta's Whistle Stop bar for the day to help the work crew.

Dave Gill of Boise agreed. He had a shock absorber mount and a radiator hose break off his truck on the way up.

Three dump trucks, a road grader and a backhoe were used to fill the holes that dot the roadway Wednesday.

Sayko said the road work was not a

solution, but a way to make the town's frustrations visible.

Until last spring, Boise National Forest provided spring and fall maintenance work on the 63 miles of road within its borders.

But John Henderson, maintenance engineer for the forest, said after research, the Forest Service determined it was a county road. Last spring, the Forest Service decided to sit back and wait for a county to take over; neither Elmore nor Boise County did.

Robins said the route has never been included in the road district's work list.

Restriction on donning Indian attire at graduation comes under attack

LEWISTON (AP) — The Lapwai School Board's adoption of a high school graduation policy placing restrictions on the Nez Perce Indian students' right to wear native dress has come under fire by the Indian Education Advisory Committee.

About 60 percent of the students are members of the Nez Perce Tribe.

"To me it sounds like more of the same thing... they're trying to make us (Indians) something we're not," said Agnes Weaskus, a member of the committee. "They're trying to strip away whatever little we've left."

"I just don't think they should say anything... I don't think they should even have a particular dress code or anything," said Georgia High eagle,

chairwoman of the committee, which represents the parents of all Indian students.

Lapwai High School's policy prohibits wearing, among other things, an eagle feather in their cap or gown at graduation. Eagle feathers have special significance for the Nez Perce.

At last year's graduation, Principal Michael Oke said: "Some students had not dressed appropriately... and had worn really rugged clothing. There had been a problem with individual students drawing attention to themselves by shouting or stepping out of line."

Ms. High eagle insisted, however, that whatever occurred was being blown out of proportion.

"I was at the graduation. One of the kids was war hopping as he went in, a few kids had eagle feathers and did a slow war dance," she said.

Oke said the board conducted a survey of what the seniors preferred, but the trustees turned it down because of protests from the students.

The school board then accepted a letter from the students, detailing how they would act and including some dress codes.

Oke said that while eagle feathers cannot be worn, they can be carried in the hand or braided in the hair.

"I think they need to respect all cultures... the Indian culture is just as valid as any other culture," Ms. Weaskus said.

McCall-Donnelly teacher receives award

BOISE (AP) — Kathryn Ruth Phelan, a music teacher at McCall-Donnelly Elementary School, was named Thursday as recipient of the \$5,000 US West outstanding teacher award.

The announcement was made at the governor's office here.

She will compete with 13 other state finalists for one of three 12-month sabbaticals being offered by US West to allow for continued professional development.

Officials of US West, the regional telephone holding company, said it received more than 1,600 nominations from the 14 states served by its three largest subsidiar-

ies, Mountain Bell, Pacific Northwest Bell and Northwest Bell.

C.E. "Gene" Hill, Idaho vice president and chief executive officer for Mountain Bell, said Ms. Phelan "reflected a commitment to students" and expressed a desire to continue reaching beyond the classroom.

Two Idaho runners-up will receive \$1,000 each.

Joyanne Tegan Thompson, advanced placement biology teacher at Capital High School, Boise, and Moscow Junior High School science teacher Daniel Monard will receive those grants.

Ms. Phelan has been teaching in the McCall-Donnelly School District since 1977.

BLM plans to allow grazing on fire-ravaged Squaw Butte

EMMETT (AP) — The U.S. Bureau of Land Management plans to allow livestock grazing on Squaw Butte near Emmett, ravaged by fire two years ago, after the steering committee for the area failed to establish a grazing program.

"We didn't get a recommendation from the committee," said Dick Geier,


Cascade Resource Area manager for the BLM. "They couldn't reach a consensus."

Russ Heughins, a steering committee member who advocated resting the range for at least another year, said: "It's sort of getting to be an exercise in futility. They say they want public comment, but the BLM

doesn't want to listen. It's a lot like butting your head against a brick wall."

The 80,000-acre fire destroyed most of the bitterbrush and sagebrush in the area, a chief source of food for mule deer.

"Our feeling is they won't trample (the brush)," Geier said.



Trade figures: loss stocks into freefall

NEW YORK (AP) — Unexpected news of an increase in the nation's trade deficit touched off a freefall slide in the stock market Thursday, leaving the Dow Jones industrial average with its second three-day loss this year.

Dow Jones' average of 30 blue chips plunged 101.46, to 2,006.63, for its largest loss since it fell 140.58 on Jan. 8 and its fifth biggest point drop ever.

Declining issues overpowered advances by about 11 to 1 in the overall tally on the New York Stock Exchange, with 1,44 up, 1,601 down and 245 untraded.

Big Board volume came to 211.81 million shares, against 185.12 million in the previous session. The NYSE's composite index fell 6.06 to 147.14.

Before the market opened the Commerce Department reported that the nation's trade deficit widened to \$13.83 billion in February from \$12.44 billion the month before.

That came as a shock to market participants, who had been looking for a continued narrowing in the gap

between imports and exports.

The dollar dropped sharply in foreign exchange markets on the news, and U.S. credit markets also took the news badly.

Prices of long-term Treasury bonds fell more than \$10 for each \$1,000, in the 8.85-8.9 percent range. Just a few weeks ago government bond yields got as low as about 8.3 percent.

Stock-market analysts said persistent strength in imports, in particular, raised fears that the Federal Reserve might soon feel the need to tighten credit to restrain the economy as well as to support the dollar.

"You got a nasty bit of news," said Lou Wachob at Prudential-Bache Securities. "The market is saying that the economy is too strong."

The decline in the Dow reached 50 points at mid-afternoon, activating for the second-time the "collar" set up by the New York Stock Exchange in early February. At that point the exchange asked its member firms to not

use its main computerized trading system for program trading.

But prices kept falling. Analysts noted that the Dow had climbed nearly 130 points from April 5 through Tuesday, largely on anticipation of favorable trade news.

This morning's report, they said, effectively wiped out the basis for that rally.

Multi-point losers among the blue-chips included Merck, down 7 1/2 at \$59.94; International Business Machines, down 4 1/2 at \$113; Coca-Cola, down 2 1/2 at \$74; Procter & Gamble, down 4 3/4 at \$77; and General Motors, down 3 1/2 at \$75.

Digital Equipment, which reported approximately flat first-quarter earnings on Wednesday, led 5 1/2 to 103 1/2.

One of the few issues that bucked the downturn was Resorts International class A shares, up 3 1/2 at \$13 in American Stock Exchange

trading. Donald Trump and Merv Griffin, who have been battling for control of the company, reached an agreement that would ultimately give holders other than Trump \$38 a share.

As measured by Wilshire Associates' index of more than 6,000 actively traded stocks, the market lost \$99.69 billion, or 3.76 percent, in value.

Standard & Poor's index of 400 industrials fell 14.7 to 302.34, and S&P's 500-stock composite index was down 11.82 at 259.75.

'Winners and Losers' inspires imagination

Latest CSI offering incorporates diverse sources, characters

TWIN FALLS — What do gargoyles, chickens, skunks and children have in common?

The answer? They all share billing in "Winners and Losers" Readers Theatre production scheduled for April 21-23 at the College of Southern Idaho.

Those characters and others, interpreted by 10 CSI drama students and their director Fran Tanner, are part of a compilation of material focusing on — what else — winners and losers.

"We focus on people in life who are losers and people in life who are winners, and some who are such that it's your own interpretation of whether they've won or lost," says Tanner.

Act One of the production will be "The Rocking Horse Winner," a play the CSI forensic squad has taken to forensic (speech and drama) competitions this year. "Rocking Horse" has won the team five trophies.

The six squad members are part of the Readers Theatre cast, a very imaginative and creative group, says Tanner.

"They were eager to try to have a hand at directing, so what we have done is that we have incorporated various kinds of poetry and prose into a collection of materials, a compilation. And, as part of their class work, each student is directing — at least two short pieces."

Some of the works incorporated into the production were authored by Carl Sandburg; Robert Frost; Rod McKuen and CSI English Professor Dean Pettinger.


"What we are concerned about in Readers Theatre is sharing the literature with the audience and to share the literature, we have to be as faithful as we can to the authors," says Tanner.

As a result of the varied pieces, each student will be taking on the roles of several different characters.

It's intriguing, it's so different. Everybody's bringing different characters to life without any use of costumes. You're not just one person, you play many different people here," says Derrick Hanson, a first-year drama student who was active in drama at Twin Falls High School.

Readers Theatre is a means of sharing literature with an audience, according to Tanner. "In Readers Theatre we suggest the character and you share the character, but it is more of a style of having the author work through you."

Traditionally, Readers Theatre has placed greater emphasis on the spoken word. An actor would stand on stage and read out of a manuscript. But lately, the emphasis has shifted to a more visual interpretation. "Theatre offers a promise of involvement and excitement. Sending our material out into acoustic space, erasing the fourth wall, use pantomime, suggestion. We place the action in the center of the audience," says Tanner.

For example, two actors speaking to each other in Readers Theatre will stand side by side with their eyes focusing at a common spot in the audience rather than face each other as is done in conventional theater.

In conventional theater, a "fourth wall" is established through which the audience sees the play, while in Readers Theatre the fourth wall is removed and the actors recognize and accept the audience, says Tanner.

For example, during a fight scene in Readers Theatre, two actors, facing the audience might drive their fist into mid-air toward the audience rather than at each other, and in turn grasp their abdomens as if hit by the other's clenched fist. "The action is completed within the imagination of the audience," says Tanner.

The presence of a script in the actors' hands "gives the people the illusion that you're interpreting the material for them rather than acting it out," says Hanson.

Readers Theatre is presentational theater. "With the focus of the actors on stage we are trying to place the scene in the audience... Our purpose in this style is to ignite the audience's imagination so that they can help to complete what we suggest," says Tanner.

Tanner likens the involvement of the audience's imagination to a listener's involvement in a radio drama. "That's what we do here, except besides the voices—we do have the body that we can suggest—characterization or movement."

obtain a permit, whether the filming is on private or public land.



Scenery or props used in Readers Theatre only suggest the real object. Often a stool will represent a table, and a box, a wall.

Tanner says audience members who have not been exposed to Readers Theatre may take a few minutes to adjust to the concept, however, many people have said they like a play done better in Readers Theatre than in the conventional theatre.

Students also come to enjoy their work in Readers Theatre equally as much as conventional plays.

"At first when I took this class, I didn't like Readers Theatre as much as conventional theater but as time went on, it just grew on me and now I like it as much — I enjoy it," says Kyle Leuze, also of Twin Falls.

"One of the neatest things I think about Readers Theatre is the fact that it doesn't take a lot of money to do it. You don't need any sets; any costumes or any makeup and yet you can completely entertain an audience for hours," says Hanson.

"You can do prose, poetry...or anything you want, there's no limit. That is the great thing. Like about Readers Theatre," says student Heather Marley, of Twin Falls.

The 10 students who make up the production say they have been able to offer a lot of input into the interpretation of the material and that it has been a valuable learning experience for them.

"The whole entire cast's imagination is put into this particular play," says Ike Adams, a student from South Carolina.

"I think you have a lot more input here at CSI than at probably the other schools, and that's because of the small drama department," he says.

Tanner, a Twin-Falls-native, chairman of the drama department, and

one of the original faculty members at CSI, "has always been interested in drama and teaching."

"I like to teach, I like interaction with students, I like being an effective teacher," she says.

Her students praise her for her dedication and knowledge.

"She's been teaching this (drama) for years, and is probably one of the greatest...so I feel privileged to learn RT under her," says Adams.

"The reason I find her so fabulous...is she has a lot of knowledge about everything and not only that, she really cares about her students and she'll really help you out," Hanson adds.

'18 Again' offers too little George Burns, too much tedium

ther. In infinitesimal variations of the same tiny idea, movie fathers have gone off to high school, high-schoolers have invaded board rooms and the wrong person has been found on skateboards. Now in the relentlessly unfunny "18 Again," George Burns turns up in the slight-body-of-his-18-year-old grandson (Charlie Schlatter). As directed with the heaviest of hands by newcomer Paul Flaherty

from an impoverished screenplay by debuting feature writers Josh Goldstein and Jonathan Prince, it is not likely to make fans of either 18- or 81-year-olds. Burns is barely in the movie at all. Brought on to bookend the story fore and aft, he throws a few comments over his shoulder like a disgruntled actor and is gone. We are left with a thoroughly pleasant young actor wagging a cigar and doing George Burns

schtick for what seems like a very long time. Nothing appears real or fresh, every character or story twist seems to have been copied down from some dim 12-inch television screen flickering away in an attic somewhere in 1962. Burns plays the still-active head of a Midwestern novelty-phone factory; Anita Morris has been cruelly directed as his gold-digging mistress; Tony Roberts is his put-upon son; Red Buttons is his oldest and best friend;

Schlatter is his sweet but shy college-pledge grandson. And absolutely nothing happens that might surprise us in any of this. (How dare the film makers have Morria reprise, breath by breath, Marilyn Monroe's singing of "Happy Birthday to You." Is nothing sacred?) Because the picture is also glaringly unattractive with a TV-dramatic kind of look to it, it is fortunate that Schlatter has the charm that he has, or things might have been really unen-

durable. It is his first major role (the first minor one was only last week in "Bright Lights, Big City" as Michael J. Fox's younger brother), and he gets by on self-effacement and a radiating warmth, particularly in his scenes with Burns or lovely Jennifer Runyon, the classmate on whom he has a crush. However, this is very little to be thankful for as we doze fitfully and wait for Granddad to pop in again and wake us from our naps.

Comedy highlights this week's movies

The following are capsule reviews of some of the films playing locally in the Magic Valley.

BETLEJUICE (PG). Uproarious ghost comedy that is a dazzling display of the pop culture sensibility of director Tim Burton, director of "Pee-wee's Big Adventure." Albie Baldwin and Geena Davis are a ghostly New England couple who seek help from England, "big-exorcist" Michael Keaton to rid their home of an awful upscale Manhattan couple (Jeffrey Jones, Catherine O'Hara). With Winona Ryder, Sylvia Sidney, Dick Cavett, Robert Gould.

BILOXI BLUES (PG-13). In Neil Simon's autobiographical play, he recalls his life and hard times as an Army recruit in 1945 in Biloxi, Miss. — and, as filmed by director Mike Nichols, the movie has marvelous moments and thoroughly engaging performances by Matthew Broderick and company. Nichols seems to have perfect pitch when he's working with Simon. He does not punch the jokes the way other directors do; he picks up the laughs on the way to something else — and he also gives the story a baroque visual style: mixing Norman Rockwell with Orson Welles and George Stevens.

BRIGHT LIGHTS, BIG CITY (R). How could a movie made from the funny-frightening novel have bottomed out this spectacularly? A capital director James Bridges is a white stylist, the film needed a great deal more than style. And star Michael J. Fox, as the film-novel's self-destructive protagonist — is puppyish and charming, but it is absolutely impossible to believe him at any point in the film. The picture might have had a chance with co-star Kiefer Sutherland in Fox's role; both he and Tracy Pollan are fine, and so are Dianne Wiest and Jason Robards in what amount to cameos. This is not a shabby, embarrassing film, but it is the work of an intelligent director who cannot think his way into what his film needs: passion.

GOOD MORNING, VIETNAM (R). This dramatic comedy based on the 1965 Saigon gig of wildman Armed Forces deejay Adrian Cronauer is mostly failed satire. It clings to the obvious like a drowning man to an anvil, and director (but non-writer) Barry Levinson can't summon up the wit or bite of his "Diner" or "Tin Men." But Robin Williams, as Cronauer, saves it; he explodes the center in berserk bursts of electronic aereality. **JOHNNY BE GOOD (PG-13).** This would-be satire of big-time college football recruiting — with nice-guy

high school players furiously pursued and — corrupted — by — unscrupulous schools — is so bad the NCAA might consider using it as punishment for the coaches who violate their regulations. Everything misfires here: They even use Judas Priest's version of "Johnny B. Goode" for the end-titles, rather than Chuck Berry's. And should Anthony Michael Hall really be playing the country's most sought-after high school football star? Huntz Hall might have been better. Or Annie Hall. Or even the Albert Hall.

THE LAST EMPEROR (PG-13). The producers of this coolly lavish epic have given free rein to the cinema's most voluptuous troika of imagists: director Bernardo Bertolucci, production designer Ferdinando Scarfotti and cinematographer Vittorio Storaro. Thus the story of China's last emperor and his struggles in a modernizing world becomes cool and dis-

tant, yet an absolutely unparalleled feast-for-the-eye-Winner-of-nine-Oscars, including best picture, best director.

MOONSTRUCK (PG). This is an incredibly nourishing comedy, filled as it is like rigatoni with warmth, cheer and terrific snappy dialogue. As a young widow whose life suddenly

shifts 180 degrees under the spell of an extraordinary full-moon from plain to juicy, Cher (Oscar winner for best actress) finally has a role that lets her comic sensibilities out for a romp. Cage attacks the role of Ronny — the guy Cher really falls for — with a nice balance between unbridled romanticism and tongue-in-cheek seriousness; he is marvelous.

Miep Gies' heroic story of hiding Anne Frank brings back memories

"Please don't see us as heroes," implored a 79-year-old Dutch-accented woman named Miep Gies. "We only did our human duty. The heroes were the people who needed help; those eight people in the attic. For two years — every single day — they had to wonder whether or not they'd survive."

Miep Gies was addressing a press conference full of quietly respectful reporters in a New York hotel recently. They had come to ask about the CBS movie "The Attic: The Hiding of Anne Frank" (airing Sunday). Somehow the mere presence of feisty Miep Gies and her 82-year-old husband Henk made more poignant — and incredibly real — the tragic historic events the couple had been a part of more than 40 years earlier. The Gies were the Amsterdam couple who hid Anne Frank, her family and four others in an attic for two years, before the hiding place was discovered and its occupants were deported to concentration camps. Anne, age 15, died in Bergen-Belsen of typhus in 1944, shortly before Europe was liberated by the Allied forces.

But Miep Gies was more than just the woman who hid away the family. It was she who found and kept Anne's diary. After the war, she passed it on to Anne's father, Otto Frank (played by Paul Scofield in the movie), the only occupant of the attic who survived the war. "The Diary of a Young Girl" became a best seller around the world, and under the title "The Diary of Anne Frank," it later became a play, a 1959 movie and a 1980 TV movie. "I think that Anne's diary is the most eloquent anti-war statement ever written," Mary Steenburgen, who plays Miep Gies in the movie, told reporters.

But this TV movie is not a retelling of the diary story. "That told what was happening inside the attic; this is what was happening outside," says Miep Gies. A longtime employee of Otto Frank, she did not think twice



when she was asked to help hide the family, with whom she was quite close. Her soon-to-be husband was already a member of the Dutch underground. And Miep Gies reiterates that hers was not a singular act, "There are many people who did what we did."

"She didn't plan to do anything heroic," said Steenburgen. "She took it one day at a time. It had to be done,

and she did it. But the fact is it all took extraordinary courage." Steenburgen took the role — her first for network television — because she liked the screenplay and was drawn to the character. "Miep is not Joan of Arc. She's not one of those head-held-high, wind-whipping-in-the-hair, obvious heroines, and that's what I love about her. Playing her felt like flight. It wasn't like trudging along having a hard time playing it."

The part really came alive for Steenburgen when she arrived in Amsterdam, where on-location filming was done. "There, these events aren't just memories out of a murky past. They're alive. They have resonance. People there are very passionate about what happened," she said pointing at Miep Gies with pride.

A: An American writer, Carol Easton, has started work on the book much to the dismay of du Pre's family, specifically her husband and her brother. It was known only to a few and never to Jacqueline that her husband, the renowned pianist Daniel Barenboim, had another family, a Russian pianist and two children living in France during the years his wife was slowly dying of multiple sclerosis. Barenboim never neglected his wife, but, according to Easton, the rest of her family spent little time with her, leaving the artist in the care of a nurse.

Q: Watching the Winter Olympics reminded me of the wonderful Sonja Henie, who won gold medals in 1928, 1932 and 1936. Didn't she finally die poverty stricken? — P.C.

A: Sonja Henie, who brought glamour to ice skating before going on to ice shows and movies, always had money. According to David Wallechinsky's fascinating new "Complete Book of the Olympics," Sonja's father owned the largest fur company in Norway. After that good start she then went on to marry New York Yankees owner millionaire Dan Topping, and then Norwegian ship owner millionaire Niels Onstad. 'General Hospital' survives rocky start to become an ABC mainstay

It began as an April Fool's joke with a cast of four — John Berardino, Emily McLaughlin, Jane Taylor and Roy Thinnies — a quarter of a century ago.

It was called "General Hospital," an offshoot of a dreadful pilot, "Emergency Ward," ABC's initial attempt at an afternoon soap in the West.

Strapped for money, ABC allowed the cast and crew a half-hour of taping time. Presto, the show was in action. Cameras wheeled in and out, actors watched for cues to speed up or slow down and, if they were lucky, they faced the right camera.

John Berardino, who played Dr. Steve Hardy, called the result a "Polish western." The soap's witty organist, George Wright, later dubbed it "Genital Hospital." People had to laugh to survive.

"Producer Jim Young cut my salary \$200 right off the bat," said Berardino the other day. "Emily McLaughlin as Nurse Jessie Brewer and I were on camera most of the time, five days a week, and we were going batty. If we made a mistake they kept it in. There was no time for any corrections."

Mistakes and all, "General Hospital" survived birth, budget and growing pains. In 1967, when the soap graduated to number one, instead of receiving a bonus Berardino was sent to New York to bolster the new "One Life to Live." ABC brains figured that Dr. Steve Hardy would draw fans wherever he went.

Flushed with the success of "General Hospital," creators Frank and Doris Hursley developed another soap, "Bright Promise," leaving GH scripts in the hands of their daughter Bridget Dobson and her husband Jerome.

"Our writing fell off," Berardino recalls. "The audience began to lose interest. All of us became so frustrated that we petitioned the network to fire the writers. We won, but the next writers weren't much help either."

Then programming genius Fred Silverman contributed to the problem by

expanding GH by 15 minutes to run in tandem with 45 minutes of "One Life to Live." That meant that Steve, Jessie and company went on the air at the uneven time of 2:15 p.m. Audiences didn't want to adapt. GH was bound for the emergency room.

Producer-director Tom Donovan endured further writing problems and hoped for a miracle when ABC decided to expand the show to a full hour. In desperation, the network called on soap director Gloria Monty.

She took one look at the scripts and junked them. "Gloria knew the game," Berardino went on. "She loosened the purse strings, wangled decent writing, brought in fresh youngsters and a new look. It saved our lives. The show reversed course, and soon we were number one again."

Berardino laughs, picks up his cane and ambles back to the set. After double hip operations and back problems, he is about to throw the cane away and join his buddies for a black-tie anniversary party. Even organist George Wright promises to be there to snicker with Emily McLaughlin.

Does the public want the same technology the industry wants?

LAS VEGAS, Nev. — The American public may be less willing than the television industry believes to embrace a high-resolution TV system with improved picture quality, clearer images and more brilliant color, according to a study released Monday.

The results of the study, by the Media Laboratory at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, "contradict the accepted wisdom ... which posits that high definition TV knocks the socks off everyone who sees it."

The study found that, to most viewers, the differences between conventional TV and high definition TV, called HDTV, are subtle and that screens would have to be two to three times the size of sets found in most American living rooms to have a significant impact.

The Japanese have been working on HDTV for nearly 20 years and are moving forward quickly. They plan to give a preview of their system with broadcasts of this summer's Seoul Olympics to HDTV sets in about 50 big-city department stores throughout the country.

The picture on a standard television set in the United States is produced by a signal that scans more than 200,000 dots on 525 lines. The Japanese system has 1,125 scanning lines.

Of the 613 people who participated in the study, 62 percent said they preferred the quality of HDTV overall.

However, "this indicates that HDTV is not the same kind of revolutionary shift in technology as experienced in the transition to color in the 1950s and 1960s in the United States," said a report on the study written by W. Russell Neuman, associate professor at the Media Laboratory, and released at the National Association of Broadcasters convention here.

"Although engineers and broadcast professionals see the difference immediately and strongly prefer HDTV ... the differences are more subtle to the

untrained eye of the mass audience," the report said.

HDTV is the most talked about development at this year's convention, which began Saturday and ends Tuesday.

Broadcasters are concerned that U.S. research efforts to develop an industry transmission standard for HDTV, still years away in the United States, may not be moving fast enough to head off a probable Japanese invasion of the new technology.

HDTV is expected to be introduced by the Japanese to homes in their country in 1990.

The Japanese system requires more than the space allocated to TV channels on the electromagnetic spectrum. In Japan, the HDTV system called Hi-Vision will be transmitted by satellite to small rooftop antennas, avoiding the bandwidth problem that would be faced by over-the-air broadcasting. But special HDTV receivers will be needed to see the enhanced picture.

One of the U.S. broadcasters' greatest fears is that the Japanese will begin exporting to the United States HDTV video cassette recorders and receiver sets that would not receive

over-the-air broadcast signals.

"We're fooling ourselves if we don't think the people in the video cassette, cable and movie industries are going to take advantage of that," said Michael J. Sherlock of NBC, which is developing a system that improves picture quality though not as significantly as the Japanese HDTV system.

"Broadcasters could be put out of business or severely hurt if we take too long" to meet the competition with an improved television picture, he said.

But Neuman's report said the American public is unlikely to rush out to buy HDTV sets, which are expected to cost upwards of \$3,500 when first introduced.

The Media Lab study, admittedly "an early experiment," was conducted in a shopping mall in Danvers, Mass., in early December 1987. For 30 minutes, a total of 613 randomly selected shoppers, in groups of five to 20, watched a variety of programs on conventional and HDTV sets.

Though viewers could usually see a difference in picture quality between the two sets and overall liked HDTV more, they preferred a conventional picture for some of the programming, the study found.

CBS leads season

NEW YORK (AP) — CBS, with an assist from college basketball, tied NBC in the Nielsen ratings last week but is still doomed to a last-place finish for the season with just a week to go.

Tying NBC is the closest CBS has come to winning a week in the 29 so far this season. NBC has won 24 weeks. ABC won the others when it had special sporting events like the World Series and the Winter Olympics.

For the week ending April 10, NBC and CBS both had average, prime-time ratings of 14.0. ABC had an 11.2. NBC is way head on the season with an average 16.1.

ABC is second with 13.7 and CBS third with 13.5.

CBS got its boost from the Monday night championship NCAA basketball game, which got in 18.8 rating and 30 share and was seventh in the rankings.

The rating is a percentage of the nation's 88.6 million households with televisions. The share is a percentage of sets in use.

CBS also had a good Sunday night. "Murder, She Wrote" ranked second behind NBC's "The Cosby Show." "60 Minutes," ranked eighth, and CBS' Sunday movie, a remake of the classic western "Red River," was ninth.




