Twin Falls stopoff set by Bush

BOISE — Vice President George Bush will visit Boise and Twin Falls next week as part of a western presidential campaign swing, Bush's Idaho campaign headquarters announced Thursday.

Senate President Pro Tem James Risch, R-Boise, Idaho chairman of the Bush for President campaign, said the vice president plans to be in Boise on the afternoon of Thursday, May 5, and will travel to Twin Falls for an overnight stop.

On Friday, May 6, Bush hopes to hold meetings with farmers in the Twin Falls area, Risch said.

Bush, who has visited Idaho a number of times during his two terms as vice president, already has accumulated enough delegates to capture the Republican Party's presidential nomination.

Most of the Idaho supporters of the candidacy of Senate Minority Leader Bob Dole have shifted to the Bush camp since the Kansas senator dropped out of the GOP race earlier this spring.

Attorneys agree to buy former bank, 2 of ... all buildings

TWIN FALLS — Two Twin Falls attorneys have tentatively agreed to buy the vacant Idaho First building on Main Street and two others nearby on Shoshone Street.

John Hepworth and John Lezamiz say they plan to demolish the two old buildings and remodel the 18,000-square-foot Idaho First building for commercial office space.

Although Idaho First wasn't a retail business, the purchase may indicate a transition to a downtown area where offices and other non-retail businesses vie with retail establishments for predominance. It's also one of the first major transactions to reverse a moving-out spree on Main Avenue.

The two attorneys plan to renovate the bank building and lease it to one or more tenants and tear down the furniture store for parking.

"We're looking at a downtown, commercial tenant building," Lezamiz said.

The rental arrangements for the bank building will be handled by Randy Anderson, an agent with Coldwell Banker Western Realty, which handled the sale. Anderson said he expects to close the verbal agreement on the deal in 30 days.

Hepworth, Lezamiz and their law firm's expansion have renovated the block of Shoshone Street from Main Avenue to 2nd Avenue North.

Their law firm has purchased and is renovating a building next to their current building at 133 Shoshone N. Because of that move Warner Music is moving into the old Shirley and Wyatt building.

Across Shoshone Street are the three buildings Hepworth and Lezamiz bought.

"That whole side of the block will be filled, and Idaho First will be filled,"

said Sue Jones, coordinator of the Downtown Business Improvement District. "It's positive, very positive."

Hepworth quipped that he and his partner bought the building because of "stupidity."

"Actually, we've been distressed to have one of the main corners of Twin Falls empty," he said.

Hepworth wouldn't disclose the actual purchase price of the three pieces. See BUILDINGS on Page A2

U.S. shifts its policy on Noriega

WASHINGTON — The White House, in an apparent policy shift, backed away Thursday from insisting that Panamanian strongman Manuel Antonio Noriega leave Panama.

Instead, it suggested the United States would settle for his resignation as commander of the Defense Forces.

The development came as a top State Department official was reported to be visiting Panama for the second time in less than two weeks for talks with Noriega, who has been indicted on federal drug-trafficking charges in Florida.

Presidential spokesman Marlin Fitzwater indicated that administration had not changed its policy, but President Reagan and other top officials had said previously Noriega's departure from Panama was a minimal requirement for resolving Panama's political crisis.

"Our policy is that General Noriega must go, which means leave power. We've talked about that a number of times. We have said we prefer him to leave Panama, but the policy issue is to leave power," Fitzwater told reporters.

The spokesman noted that Reagan, Secretary of State George Shultz, and other administration officials have stated that they want Noriega to not only step down, but also leave Panama.

Amnesty extension for aliens shot down

WASHINGTON — The Senate on Thursday night virtually killed any chance that Congress would vote to extend the May 4 deadline for illegal aliens to apply for amnesty.

The action came on a procedural vote to shut off debate by those who oppose extending the amnesty to Nov. 30. Only 40 senators voted to shut off the debate and 60 votes are needed to do so. Fifty-six senators voted against shutting off debate.

The Senate will be in recess when the deadline arrives next Wednesday, so there is no chance that proponents of the extension can try again.

The House approved the extension on April 21 by a 213-201 vote.

The immigration law enacted in 1986 was finely tuned legislation that carefully balanced a legalization program for illegal aliens with

penalties for employers who knowingly hire undocumented workers.

The Senate vote and the narrow House margin demonstrated that amnesty for those who came to this country illegally before Jan. 1, 1982 remains an emotional issue.

Aliens who came to this country illegally before 1983 and have lived here continuously since then were given one year to apply for temporary residency as the first step toward permanent status. May 4 ends the one-year period.

Immigration offices will remain open until midnight on Wednesday. The INS already has begun a program that allows people to sign up now and produce the necessary documentation later.

The Immigration and Naturalization Service had recommended a presidential veto. If President Reagan followed the advice, his veto likely would have been sustained.

Sex, drug convictions mean AIDS tests under Senate bill

WASHINGTON — The Senate on Thursday passed a billion-dollar AIDS information and research bill that calls for mandatory AIDS testing of people convicted of sex and drug crimes.

"Finally, we have declared war on the virus and not on the victims in our battle against AIDS," Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., said after the 87-4 vote.

Those senators voting against the AIDS bill were Helms; William Armstrong, R-Colo.; James McClure, R-Idaho; and Malcolm Wallop, R-Wyo. Not voting on the bill were Sens. Joseph Biden, D-Del.; David Boren, D-Okla.; Lawton Chiles, D-Fla.; Daniel Evans, R-Wash.; David Karnes, R-Neb.; Jay Rockefeller, D-W.Va.; Paul Simon, D-Ill.; John Stennis, D-Miss.; Steve Symms, R-Idaho.

The vote came after hours of bitter argument over the content of educational materials paid for with federal dollars.

Tempera were lost, curses hurled and senators denied the opportunity to speak as lawmakers debated whether to renew a 1987 ban on federally funded materials that directly promote or encourage homosexuality.

The ban, which expires Sept. 30, was passed last year 94-2. But sentiment shifted this year after several senators said it was having a chilling effect on public health efforts in the homosexual community, which has the highest percentage of AIDS victims.

The Senate agreed to the ban sponsored by Sen. Jesse Helms, R-N.C., but also agreed to another provision that says education materials should stress the public health benefits of abstinence, a single monogamous relationship and avoidance of intravenous drug use. The provision also says no other part of the bill should restrict the dissemination of accurate information to anyone at risk, apparently supplanting the Helms ban.

In addition to voting unanimously to approve mandatory AIDS testing of

people convicted of sex and drug crimes, the Senate also accepted neutralized versions of several conservative amendments that supporters said would have hampered the bill.

Sens. Kennedy and Orrin Hatch, R-Utah, sponsors of the fiscal 1989 research and education bill, called it the nation's first comprehensive statement of an AIDS policy. The two are chairman and ranking minority member, respectively, of the Senate Labor and Human Resources Committee.

The bill authorizes \$665 million for state and federal AIDS education programs, increased hiring at the National Institutes of Health, a new home health care program for AIDS victims and special efforts to help high-risk minorities and intravenous drug abusers. A committee aide said open-ended research money would bring to total to about \$1.1 billion in annual spending.

The bill's passage also was lauded by Victor Blasis, executive director of the Human Rights Campaign Fund. See AIDS on Page A2

Battle over SIS continues in Senate Armed Services panel

IDAHO FALLS — The Department of Energy would have to certify the safety and need for the Special Isotope Separation project, under legislation approved by the Senate Armed Services Committee Wednesday.

The project is aimed at producing weapons-grade plutonium. The Idaho National Engineering Laboratory in eastern Idaho is trying to land the \$1 billion laser technology plant.

The amendment to a defense authorization bill, offered by Sen. James Exon, D-Neb., orders DOE to report to the committee by Nov. 1, 1989 that SIS technology is ready for routine, safe operation on a production scale in Idaho. It also would have to certify that the plutonium refined by the SIS is needed and locating it in Idaho is consistent with DOE's long range plans.

Exon's amendment replaced a stronger version offered by Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., barred spending for construction of SIS until next February.

Sen. Steve Symms, R-Idaho, led the fight against the Kennedy amendment. He said the Exon amendment will not affect SIS development.

"We had the votes to defeat Kennedy's amendment but Exon offered some language

that according to Don Ofte (INEL manager) at the site will be absolutely no problem," said Symms. "It's harmless."

But an SIS opponent said the amendment signals growing concern about the project on Capitol Hill.

"This is really the first time there has been any serious debate in the Senate Armed Services Committee about the SIS," said Dan Reich, an attorney with the Natural Resources Defense Council. "This is just the first shot in a battle that will take a couple of years to win."

Symms said the committee action was part of a strategy by liberal Democrats to

block modernization of the nuclear weapons complex. That strategy includes forcing delays and creating obstacles to SIS.

"The roadblocks we are encountering are clearly the work of a very small minority in Idaho working with the Democrats to prevent the SIS from coming about," Symms said.

"He (Kennedy) is carrying water for the Snake River Alliance," said Symms. "It's the nuclear freeze-nik crowd. These are people that would rather be Red than dead."

Sen. Phil Gramm, R-Texas, joined Symms in opposing Kennedy's amendment.

"We need this facility for the good of our national defense," Gramm was quoted as saying

NASA picks U of I for specialized computer chip design research

WASHINGTON (AP) — The University of Idaho is one of nine universities selected by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration Thursday to conduct research in specialized computer chip design.

Gov. Cecil Andrus said in Boise that Idaho will receive a direct return of \$10 million on its investment in research facilities at the Moscow school, and said it could lead to more business for related industries.

NASA said the schools selected for research can receive up to \$500,000 for research for the first year and projects can grow to \$1 million per year for four years.

A release from NASA Thursday to the office of Sen. James McClure and others said the work will support NASA's goal of broadening the nation's engineering capability to meet critical needs of the civilian space program.

Officials said this year's grants will allow new opportunities for university specialization, such as Mars mission technology; extraterrestrial materials, in-space construction and large, space-based observatories.

The nine centers were selected from 115 proposals submitted last November. Andrus said among the schools competing with Idaho for the research projects were Stanford, California-Berkeley and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

The research center is directed by Gary Maki.

NASA said the Micro Electronics Research Center in the University of Idaho's Engineering Department will be part of the National Hardware Acceleration centers.

The center will design custom computer chips for NASA, and will receive funding for the next five years.

The governor's office said there will be an opportunity to continue the research for a decade.

"Once again we are proving, and proving dramatically, the direct link between quality higher education and economic development," the governor said, after the NASA grant was announced.

"Idaho will receive a direct return of about \$10 million on its investment in the Micro Electronics Research Center, but that's not all. The project

will result in more business for related industries in the state," he said.

The governor said it's the largest single national center grant ever awarded to a university in Idaho for research.

"I am very pleased that we have shown how Idaho scientists can compete successfully with their counterparts across the country," he said.

Scientists and engineers from across the state supported the Idaho grant application. Top-level managers from Hewlett-Packard in Boise and EG&G Idaho, Inc., were on hand when NASA conducted a site visit earlier this month.

The research center last month received \$384,000 of a special \$2 million appropriation from the 1987 Idaho Legislature. The money was intended to make better use of university research programs.

The center also received an additional \$100,000 from the last legislative session.

The center will receive \$500,000 during the current fiscal year, which ends Oct. 31. Once it designs the specialized computer chips, Hewlett-Packard will manufacture them.

Utah regulators say Mountain Bell overbilled customers \$30 million

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Mountain Bell telephone customers have been overbilled by up to \$30 million in the past year, and unless rates are reduced the overcharging could continue through the remainder of 1988, state regulators say.

Mountain Bell reduced its rates by \$9 million last December, but a study by the state's Committee of Consumer Services contends rates should be lowered further.

"We've been investigating Mountain Bell for over a year, and we are confident a \$30-million rate reduction is justifiable," committee Chairman Felshaw King said.

Public Service Commissioner James Byrne acknowledged, "there's clearly a trend, and ratepayers should be encouraged" by the possibility of less-expensive phone service by the end of the year.

He said the initial \$9 million rate cut was the first part of a general trend toward rate reductions caused by Mountain Bell earning in excess of its state authorized rate of return.

Regulators have capped the phone company's profits at 14.2 percent of its stockholders' investment.

The estimated \$30 million in overcharges was attributed to a combination of excess profits from directory listing services, overcollecting for operating costs and lower federal income taxes, the committee said.

Utah's Division of Public Utilities has also monitored the phone company's earnings and found Mountain Bell could continue to overearn by as much as \$28 million this year, based on the company's 1988 budget figures, Byrne said.

Mountain Bell spokesman Ken Hill said the company's projected budget figures do show earnings "coming close to our allowed rate of return." However, he said whether rates must be reduced will depend on a PSC decision, based on information from the company and regulators.

Byrne said the committee's findings and preliminary figures from the division show a trend of Mountain Bell overearning. But he declined to determine if a rate decrease is imminent.

Power, water keys to development

BOISE (AP) — Power and water resources hold the key to Idaho's economic development, says Gov. Cecil Andrus.

And that is why the state is resisting so strongly efforts by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to expand its authority over the use of Idaho water, Andrus told the opening session of the Pacific Northwest Regional Economic Conference in Boise Thursday.

"In our view, FERC is asserting a lot of control over those resources that ought to be retained by people in Idaho or Washington or California," Andrus said in remarks prepared for the meeting.

"We think it is just a matter of common sense that people in this state are in a better position to manage wa-

ter resources than is the commission," the governor said.

A member of the federal agency was scheduled to address a later session of the economic conference.

"I know there is a difference of opinion, and that we will probably fight it out in the courts, in the Congress and in state legislatures; but the reason for the fight is anything but trivial," Andrus said.

"Fifty or 75 years ago we made resource decisions that we are living with today. And frankly, decisions we make — or FERC makes — today will determine much of our economic success over the next 50 years," he said.

Andrus said Idaho has objected to some recent FERC decisions. The federal agency in recent cases has ruled that it can decide federal power li-

cence applications without regard for state water regulations.

He said, "You keep deciding, we keep objecting. And so far we have been about as successful as the Baltimore Orioles."

But Andrus said Idaho residents "believe devoutly in their right to use and protect the water resources of this state."

Andrus asked delegates to the economic conference to come up with suggestions on how the state can attract badly needed venture and development capital; how states should be prepared to deal with deregulation of major industries and what it should be doing to expand international trade.

And he urged the economists to make good use of their reports.

"The best research or economic analysis in the world isn't worth a plugged nickel if it doesn't find its way into the hands of someone who can try to use it to make our states and the world work a little better," he said.

Vacancies on ballot filled

BOISE (AP) — Another three candidates were named by Thursday's deadline to fill legislative vacancies for the May 24 Idaho primary election.

But the net gain was just two, because one person nominated earlier dropped out.

The secretary of state's office said Kelly Kumm of Pocatello, nominated by local Democrats to seek the seat now held by Rep. L. Ed Brown, R-Pocatello, withdrew. Then Terry Haggard, Pocatello, was nominated to replace him.

Robert B. Dodson, New Plymouth, was nominated as the Democrat candidate for the District 10 House seat now held by Rep. Mary Hartung, R-Payette.

A Boise man, Steven H. Pollack, was nominated for the Democrat spot on the ballot for the District 18 Senate

seat. Sen. Jerry Hanson, R-Boise, is not running again. Two Republicans seek their party's nomination for that seat.

In all, 14 people were nominated to fill vacancies on the ballot after the April 15 filing deadline. They have a week to qualify as candidates by paying the \$15 filing fee and filing nominating petitions.

Bankers forecast flat state economy for '88

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Idaho's overall economy will be flat in 1988, with mild progress in manufacturing and high-technology industries, officials with Moore Financial Group say.

"1988 will not be a robust year, but it won't be a bad year either," said Dale Bickenstaff, vice chairman.

Bickenstaff was on hand Wednesday for a presentation in Idaho Falls of Moore Financial Group's shareholder report. He was joined by Daniel R. Nelson, Moore Financial's chairman and chief executive officer, and Robert J. Lane, president of Idaho First National Bank.

Moore Financial is a \$3.4 billion asset bank holding company, whose subsidiary banks include Idaho First National.

Bickenstaff said Idaho will follow on the heels of an expanding national economy in 1988, and he predicted strong employment gains and modest increases in real personal income.

The U.S. economy is in its fifth year of expansion. While consumer spending has slowed and interest rates may increase during the last quarter, a recession is not eminent, he said.

"Idaho will be helped by a stronger-than-expected national economy," he said.

Employment gains in Idaho are strongest in manufacturing and high-tech industries, Bickenstaff said. The latest figures indicate that per-capita income has risen 5.3 percent, outpacing the national level, he said.

In February, commercial construction in Idaho was up 69 percent, while residential building declined 29 percent.

The big question for the state is farming.

"The agricultural outlook will be a

function of the water supply and prices," Bickenstaff said.

His colleague, Lane, predicted that potato prices will not improve during the cleanup of the 1987 crop. Prices are still below \$3 a hundredweight because of increased production in Idaho and other major potato producing states, he said.

Although wheat prices have declined slightly in recent months, they responded in the final quarter of 1987 to larger export volumes resulting from a lower dollar value overseas, Lane said.

Livestock prices have risen substantially because of a smaller supply of cattle, both nationally and in Idaho, he said.

Star Wars appears to be costly failure

The United States has spent \$27 billion on missile-defense research since 1972, when it agreed with the Soviet Union to put strict limits on such defense systems. The Soviet Union has made a big investment of its own in defense experiments and a missile-defense ring around Moscow.

Washington must spend billions of dollars more — at a current rate of \$4 billion a year — before it can decide whether to build a primitive shield over the United States in response to President Reagan's dream of a so-called "Star Wars" system that will make nuclear missiles impotent and obsolete. It would then need hundreds of billions of dollars to actually construct and launch some combination of sensors and weapons to shoot down incoming missiles.

Now the Office of Technology Assessment says that after all that work and money there would be a very good chance that the defense system would "suffer a catastrophic failure" the first and only time it would ever be needed: if Soviet missiles were fired at the United States in anger.

The report is not the last word on Star Wars, only the most recent indication that the harder people outside the Star Wars bureaucracy look at the project, the less they think of it. It has been clear for some time, for example, that Reagan's vision of a leak-proof shield is beyond reach.

OTA, a think tank reporting directly to Congress, spent two years of research and analysis reaching its conclusions, which then were turned over to the Pentagon for security clearance.

The Pentagon, obviously put off by the report's dismal conclusions, kept the report out of circulation for nearly a year. After a summary of the report was printed in the Washington Post last Sunday, the Pentagon — in a display of hubris uncommon even in Washington — said that some of the more damaging criticisms of Star Wars were based on old information.

Because a Star Wars network would be the most complex system ever built, the report said, it may never be possible to depend without fear of failure on the computer software that would make it run. Certainly there is no sign that the software can be relied on in the foreseeable future, it said.

That is the answer to the question Reagan posed to scientists in 1983: Has the nation reached a level of technology where it could keep nuclear missiles from reaching its soil? It is not the one he wanted, but it still is the answer. The obvious next steps should start with a reduction of the Star Wars budget from nearly \$4 billion to \$2 billion or less, enough for basic research to make certain the Soviets do not get ahead in the field but not enough to support the razzle-dazzle public-relations stunts that are keeping the program alive in these days of tight budgets.

After that, American negotiators in arms-control talks in Geneva should join with Soviet negotiators in putting strict limits on how far or fast either country can proceed with programs that would lead to a separate new arms race, this one in outer space. That would not get back the \$27 billion that has already been spent on missile defenses. But it might be a small price to pay for a move that would clear the way for deep super-power reductions in intercontinental missiles.

Science not among legitimate enemies

A friend observed that frequently when science and religion are discussed, there is often a great deal of heat and smoke generated but very little light. Unfortunately, this has been the case with our local evolution/creationism issue. I would hope that this essay if not providing some light, at least does not further validate that observation.

From discussions with several friends, and from some of the letters in the newspaper, it is apparent that many people are confused about the terms creationist or creationism. This confusion is understandable because it just almost "seems right" that all Christians would be creationists. In fact, many people who feel that by siding with creationism, they are "defending the faith," may upon closer examination discover the teachings of creationism to be incompatible with their own church doctrine.

— Indeed, when I first heard the term creationist a few years ago, I felt that because I believe in a creator, I, too, must be a creationist. Upon study of the tenets of creationism (as taught by those at the Institute for Creation Research) I found that it teaches of an *ex nihilo* creation, i.e. creation from nothing. It teaches that God "spoke into being" everything in the universe — all time, all space, and all matter in the universe just 6000 years ago. It teaches that this creation took place in six 24-hour days. It teaches that God can make and change any and all natural laws at any whim, and hence that he probably does not operate by natural laws. I find these tenets of creationism, particularly that of an *ex nihilo* creation, to be incompatible with some basic doctrines of my church.

Although I am in basic disagreement with creationists on a theological basis, I fully respect their rights to their religious views. And I object to the religious intolerance which has been shown on these pages with regard to the creationism issue. And even though Mr. Gerrish and I are on opposite sides of this particular issue, I applaud him for the good that he accomplishes in "his life outside of the school room" as a result of his religious activities.

The controversies which we have seen in various parts of the country are a result of the attempts of some creationists to have their religious tenets taught as science in the public schools. I wrote earlier on the subject of the lack of scientific merit of creationism and there is no need to re-view the matter here. It is my observation that the teaching of religion as science does a disservice to each.

A friend of mine commented regarding creationism: "When some undertake to call it a science, and then impose it on the public school system, that becomes neither good science, good religion, nor good education."

I am very tolerant of any person's religious views, however, I am not tolerant of poor science and poor education in our schools.

The implications of evolution are indeed disturbing to many people, including some scientists. And certainly if you choose not to accept evolution, or any other scientific concept for that matter, that is strictly up to you. However, you should recognize that there is now an overwhelming amount of evidence supporting it. There is also overwhelming evidence of a very old earth. But you are certainly free to believe as you wish.

I find that science is often misunderstood by those who are not directly involved. And during our present controversy there have been several inaccurate statements made about science. Statements that have tended to cloud the real issue, and to leave other readers with a false impression of the world of science. I won't attempt to address them all, indeed the sheer number of inaccuracies would render that attempt hopeless. However, I would like to address three statements.

1. "Because real science can only deal with that which is observable, the study of origins is not real science."
Most of us are familiar with the scientific method from high school or some place. This is the cut-and-dried procedure of simplification to essential components, experiment in the controlled conditions of the laboratory, prediction and replication.

Not just evolution, but a whole suite of fundamental historical science disciplines ranging from geology, to cosmology, to linguistics — simply cannot operate by this stereotype. These sciences are charged with explaining past events of extraordinary complexity that occur but once in all their details. We try to understand the past but do not predict the future. We cannot see past processes directly, but learn to infer their operation from the results which are preserved.

Science is a pluralistic enterprise with a rich variety of methods which can be applied to various problems. Past events don't lie outside the realm of science, simply because we cannot recreate them within the laboratory during a month's time. And direct vision isn't the only, or even the usual method of inference in science. We also don't see electrons, or quarks or chemical bonds.

In a similar vein one of the letter writers mentioned the argument that the test of "falsifiability" disqualifies evolutionary studies as a real science. The philosopher, Karl Popper, was the one who made the original statement. The letter writer should note that Sir Karl has since recanted his statement in writing.

2. "There are absolutely no transitional fossils."
How many times have we heard this one? Creationists spend a great deal of time on the fossil record. This in itself is a misleading tactic because the fossil record has always been but one part of

the evolutionary spectrum. Data from all areas of biology such as biogeography, morphology, embryology, systematics, etc. also support evolutionary theory. Creationists tend to hurry past these fields.

OK, what about transitional fossils then? They are indeed not common, but they certainly are not wanting as creationists claim. Bridging fossils have been found for all of the famous gaps. Take for instance the gap that existed between reptiles and birds. Full specimens of Archaeopteryx were found early in the 1860s. One could not hope for a more perfect example of a missing link. Archaeopteryx sits on the fence between reptiles and birds. It has feathers and a fused wishbone, like a bird. It has a tail, teeth, small brain, separate digits but lacks a developed sternum, like a reptile. It is right on the border, and has been frequently classified as a reptile by those who are ignorant of its features.

Similar excellent transitional fossils exist between reptiles and mammals.

Creationists simply refuse to accept any fossil as transitional regardless of how obvious it is to any objective person. They do this for a simple reason — they have stated that if one were ever found, all of their arguments would be invalid. This whole transitional fossil thing is obviously very tenuous at best. Gaps have a way of being filled.

3. "The second law of thermodynamics proves that evolution cannot happen." (Creationists really like to invoke the second law.) Creationists should be delighted to know that one of the founders of the laws of thermodynamics, also "disproved" evolution. He didn't use the second law of thermodynamics though, he understood it too well.

This is one of those arguments that has been refuted for years. The appeal to the second law is irrelevant because the law applies only to closed systems. If one has the right kind of energy to do so, one can always make order out of disorder. The law states that in a closed system the available energy will eventually become exhausted. However, this earth of ours is an open system and usable energy has been coming in since the day the sun first started to shine on its surface. Hence, the possibility of order coming from disorder on earth is in no way barred by thermodynamics.

It is true that faceless and bureaucratic state power intrudes more and more into our lives and removes choices that should belong to individuals and communities. School curricula imposed from above appears to be one more insult. But the culprit is not science. Let's identify and fight our legitimate enemies, but science is not among them. We are facing moral decay in America, again science is not the culprit. Let us seek synthesis in our fine community, not schism.

SIS absurdity ever clearer

As more information becomes available, the absurdity of the Special Isotope Separation

project proposed for the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory becomes more clear.

This week we learn the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare is concerned about the safety of the plan to refine plutonium for nuclear weapons at INEL and has serious reservations about the adequacy of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement prepared by the Department of Energy that assures us everything would be just fine.

Measure would stall Coast Guard plan

WASHINGTON (AP) — New opposition developed Thursday on Capitol Hill to sending Coast Guard boats to the Persian Gulf, while the Coast Guard commander defended the proposal by saying it wouldn't hurt anti-drug efforts at home.

Rep. Mike Lowry, D-Wash., introduced a measure in the House that would ban use of the Coast Guard in the gulf.

"The Reagan administration should use the Coast Guard's scarce resources to fight the war on drugs, not the Iran-Iran war," Lowry said.

Sen. Brock Adams, D-Wash., told his colleagues it would be a mistake to send lightly armed Coast Guard vessels into the war-torn gulf.

Lowry's proposal will be considered next week as an amendment to a bill authorizing the Pentagon budget for the fiscal year starting Oct. 1.

The Pentagon is considering sending six Coast Guard boats to help Navy warships patrol the gulf. The Coast Guard vessels are de-

signed for shallow waters, and Navy officials say they could be effective in the shallow gulf.

The Navy is escorting 11 reflagged Kuwaiti tankers, following several clashes between the Navy and Iran, the most recent occurring April 18 when Navy ships and planes sank or damaged six Iranian vessels.

Adm. Paul A. Yost, Coast Guard commander, told a Senate subcommittee that he "would be delighted" to send the ships to the gulf and said the move would have only "a minimal impact" on anti-drug efforts.

The boats are 110-foot "Island" class vessels, designed to operate in waters off Florida and the Caribbean on anti-drug patrols. The Coast Guard is buying 35 of the vessels, of which 17 have been delivered.

The boats have a top speed of more than 26 knots, but their heaviest weapons are machine guns. Pentagon officials had considered sending the boats to the gulf last fall, but declined because they are so lightly armed.

Reduce demand for drugs, group says

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States must give highest priority to curbing demand for illicit drugs from Latin America if it expects to win the war against narcotics smuggling, a hemispheric committee said Thursday.

In a report, the group said efforts to curb trafficking through eradication and interdiction have failed and that the United States should refocus its attention to educating potential users to the dangers of drug addiction.

The report was prepared by the Inter-American Dialogue, a non-partisan group of 62 noted citizens from the United States, Latin America and Canada.

"As long as the profit margin for cocaine is 12,000 percent from production cost to street value, the lure of trafficking will be irresistible," the panel said in the 50-page report, which covered a variety of hemispheric issues. "Primary attention must shift to demand."

The commission is chaired by Sol M. Linowitz, a former U.S. ambassador to the Organization of American States, and Daniel O'Leary, a former president of Costa Rica. Other members include two other former Latin American presidents and more than a dozen former cabinet members from the United States and Latin America.

The report said efforts to reduce the supply of drugs from Latin America to the United States are bound to be inadequate, and the high profit margin

for drug smuggling "will buy all the protection the drug lords need."

The Reagan administration initially concentrated its efforts on stopping drug smuggling at its source but recently has said more attention must be given to reducing demand.

President Reagan said in a speech last February, "As significant as stopping smugglers and pushers is, ending the demand for drugs is how, in the end, we'll win."

Florida rethinks gun law

MIAMI (AP) — The shooting of three Miami police officers in a month, along with a skyrocketing murder rate, had authorities Thursday demanding a change in Florida's liberal gun law, and the state Legislature appears to be responding.

Only hours after Miami motorcycle patrolman James Hayden was wounded twice with an automatic pistol during a routine traffic stop, a state House criminal justice subcommittee voted 4-3 Thursday to recommend an amendment to the state constitution to require a seven-day cooling-off period for gun buyers.

On Wednesday, the full Senate had approved another bill that tightened up gun law loopholes allowing some convicted criminals to get concealed weapons permits.

The current relaxed gun law, approved last year over the protests of urban police agencies, all but eliminated cooling-off periods, banned local gun control ordinances, and allowed most Floridians to carry a concealed weapon.

Drugs, economics leading concerns

WASHINGTON (AP) — Anxiety about drug trafficking and foreign economic power much fear of the Soviet Union as the top concerns of Americans, according to a survey issued Thursday by a group that includes pollsters for Michael Dukakis and George Bush.

Given a choice of seven national security goals, 22 percent of those surveyed picked combatting international drug traffic as the No. 1 priority. Another 18 percent said correcting America's growing trade imbalance was the most important goal. Reducing U.S. and Soviet long range missiles was chosen by 15 percent of those surveyed.

Containing Soviet aggression was the chief concern of 12 percent, stopping the threat of nuclear weapons topped the list for 11 percent and combatting terrorism was the priority for 5 percent.

The poll said 59 percent of the American people believe economic competitors like Japan pose

more of a threat to national security than traditional military adversaries like the Soviets.

It was the fourth poll in a series called "Americans Talk Security," a 10-survey collaborative effort by four organizations, including Martilla & Kiley, of Boston, Dukakis' pollster, and Market Opinion Research of Detroit, which works for Bush. Martilla & Kiley conducted the latest poll, but the questions and analysis were approved by all four organizations.

By a margin of 3-to-1, Americans believe economic power is more important than military strength in determining a country's influence in the world.

Asked about U.S. relations with the Soviet Union, 61 percent said they were improving, 4 percent thought they were getting worse and 34 percent said they were remaining the same.

Seventy-six percent said they had a

"favorable" general impression of Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev and 66 percent said Gorbachev's policies will eventually create a more free and open society.

Asked if U.S. policy should focus less on the Soviets and more on other threats to our security, 48 percent sought less focus on the Soviets and 42 said the focus should remain on the Soviets.

Tom Kiley, who polls for Dukakis, said the Democrats are pleased that the survey shows a "broadening prism" through which Americans look at security issues.

Fred Steeper, whose Market Opinion Research company works for Bush, said he was bouyed that 61 percent of Americans chose "improved efficiency" as the key to reducing the trade deficit compared to 24 percent who chose "fairer trade practices."

President signs education aid measure

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan signed a multibillion-dollar education measure expanding services to students Thursday, but expressed regret that "current Supreme Court jurisprudence" is hostile to provisions outlawing pornographic telephone messages.

In a signing ceremony attended by the bill's sponsors and supporters in Congress, Reagan said the measure "reauthorizes and improves a wide variety of federal programs at the elementary and secondary school level."

"At the same time, it recognizes a fundamental truth: that the primary responsibility for educating these children lies with the local communities and the states and not with the federal government," he said.

Noting the ban on telephone pornography, the president said, "I commend Congress for joining the administration's long-standing effort to combat hard core obscenity."

"I am bound to note, however, as much as it displeases me, that current Supreme Court jurisprudence is unfriendly to parts of this bill," he said.

"And I hope that the courts and the Congress will work with the administration to do as much as is permitted by the Constitution to enforce the provisions of this statute."

The American Civil Liberties Union

opposed the ban on telephone pornography, saying that, although born of concern for children, it intrudes on the privacy and free speech rights of American adults.

The act authorizes up to \$8.3 billion in spending next year on elementary and secondary school programs, with more than half the money going to disadvantaged children at risk of failing.

It contains new programs to prevent dropouts and help high school students with weak skills, and greatly expands drug abuse education and magnet schools. New money also was earmarked for math, science and foreign-language programs.

Airline checks turn up infractions

WASHINGTON (AP) — The special inspection of Eastern and Continental airlines has uncovered no "grossly unsafe" conditions so far, although planes were ordered out of service briefly because of safety infractions about 5 percent of the time, officials said Thursday.

The Federal Aviation Administration began its plane-by-plane ramp inspections April 13 and so far has made more than 2,000 inspections at the two airlines, FAA Administrator

Allan McArtor told reporters. He said inspections would continue through mid-May.

Both airlines are owned by Texas Air Corp., the country's largest airline company, which also is under a special review by the federal government.

Transportation Secretary Jim Burnley said the separate inspection into the management and financial practices of Texas Air by his department is half completed and "everything is going very well." Burnley did not elaborate on any of the findings so far.

Burnley and McArtor met with reporters to announce a series of organizational changes at the FAA aimed primarily at centralizing more authority in the agency's Washington headquarters over its various regional offices.

But many of the questions turned to the FAA and department probes of Texas Air and its two airline subsidiaries.

Shell admits allowing oil to seep into marsh

MARTINEZ, Calif. (AP) — Shell Oil Co. acknowledged that an illegal practice allowed 175,000 gallons of crude oil to seep into bird sanctuaries and bays, killing almost 200 waterfowl and other wildlife and threatening more Thursday.

Larry Kolb, principal engineer with the state Regional Water Quality Control Board, called the spill an ecological disaster and estimated that it could cost Shell \$3 million in penalties and \$1 million in cleanup costs.

About 100 cleanup workers Thursday were rushed into area wetlands where winds and rising tides threatened to expand the spill, which occurred during the nesting season 40 miles northeast of San Francisco.

The spill occurred Friday night or early Saturday when a drainpipe that carries off rainwater through the middle of an oil tank at Shell's major northern California refinery broke inside the tank, allowing oil to be siphoned out.

Shell said Wednesday that it regularly allowed rain collected from the roof of the tank to flow uninspected into a nearby marsh.

The practice violated federal Environmental Protection Agency regulations, Shell's written policies and standard industry practice, refinery

manager Ron Banducci said.

He said he had no explanation for the deviation from established procedures and EPA requirements. Stormwater discharges have been inspected at the 173 other tanks in the 1,000-acre refinery, said Banducci.

"In our view, leaving the valve open when rain is predicted is not control (of rain discharges) in any sense of the word," Kolb said Thursday.

About 95,000 gallons of the San Joaquin crude, a particularly thick oil, have been recovered from a 15-mile stretch along Carquinez Strait and the Peyton Marsh, which adjoins the refinery.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congress called Lady Bird Johnson an apostle of wildflowers and honored the former first lady Thursday for "leaving an indelible imprint of loveliness on the American landscape."

The wife of the late President Lyndon B. Johnson, surrounded by her daughters, their husbands and chil-

dren, blew kisses from the Senate gallery after passage of the resolution honoring her dedication, energy and hard work in beautifying America.

The ceremony was part of several tributes planned Thursday and Friday, including ceremonies in the House and in the White House Rose Garden honoring her 75th birthday.

OPEC not unified on oil export cuts

VIENNA, Austria (AP) — OPEC ministers prepared Thursday to open a full debate on proposed oil export cuts that some analysts said may be smaller than expected.

The proposed reductions, in combination with cuts by six non-OPEC oil exporting countries, are designed to push up oil prices and codify a new spirit of cooperation among oil producers.

The six independent producers on Wednesday said they would cut oil exports by 5 percent for two months if the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries did likewise.

OPEC, however, is divided over how to respond to the offer, which is the first such proposal from rival producers since the oil cartel was formed in 1960.

Oil prices on the open market fell Thursday. Brent crude from the North Sea dropped as low as \$16.90 a barrel before closing at

\$17.20 in London, down 30 cents from Wednesday.

On the New York Mercantile Exchange, June contracts for West Texas "intermediate," the most widely traded grade of U.S. crude, were off 3 cents a barrel, to \$18.24, shortly after midday.

Iran strongly supports the non-OPEC proposal, both as a way of strengthening the oil market and as a step toward closer ties with non-OPEC producers.

"Any measures and means that can lead to this would be supported by us," the Iranian oil minister, Gholamreza Aghazadeh, told reporters on his arrival from Tehran.

Other OPEC members, including Saudi Arabia, take a more cautious view. They want to encourage outside producers to restrain their oil output, but they see little merit in the terms of the proposal under consideration in Vienna.

Strike closes territories; Israelis kill 1

JERUSALEM (AP) — Bakers and street vendors joined a protest strike Thursday that virtually closed down the occupied territories and Arab east Jerusalem. Israeli army gunfire killed one Palestinian and wounded two.

The effectiveness of the strike was at odds with declarations by Israeli authorities that the 5-month-old rebellion in the West Bank and Gaza Strip had begun to ebb.

Underground Palestinian leaders called the strike in a bulletin issued last week, and it appeared to be as widespread as dozens of others since the 1.5 million Palestinians in the occupied lands began what even the Israelis now call the "intifadah" — the uprising.

Arab reporters said bakers and street vendors, who usually operate during strikes, joined this one in most areas.

An army spokesman said troops shot and killed a 20-year-old Arab when they were attacked by hundreds of protesters after entering the village of Malek near the West Bank city of Ramallah. The soldiers were apparently going to conduct a search.

The spokesman said the troops were attacked with stones and a firebomb and fired in the direction from which the firebomb came, killing the

Palestinian.

The killing raised the Arab death toll in the rebellion to 176. An Israeli teen-ager and a soldier have also died.

In Hebron on the West Bank, about 100 young Palestinians set tires ablaze in front of the municipal building and shouted for the resignation of Mayor Abdel Majid Zir. Arab witnesses said: Zir was appointed by Israel.

A 20-year-old protester, Raed Shukied, was wounded by gunfire when Israeli troops dispersed the crowd with tear gas, rubber bullets and live ammunition, the witnesses said.

Dozens of Arabs blocked the road to Ebeven, a village near Ramallah with rocks and burning tires, then threw stones at Israeli soldiers who arrived in three jeeps, a villager reported.

The villager, who would not give his name, said a 23-year-old man was shot. He spoke to a reporter at Ramallah Hospital, where the victim was being treated for a gunshot wound in the right leg.

Army spokesmen confirmed a protester was wounded in Hebron and another near Ramallah, but said they were investigating.

Hundreds of Palestinians have been wounded since the violence began Dec. 8.

Israel radio said the army bulldozed an orange grove outside Bethlehem after a jeep skidded off a nearby road on which Palestinians had spread oil.

Soldiers followed footprints from the road to the orange grove, the radio said. Reporters who went there later found bulldozer tracks and a half-acre of uprooted orange trees.

In south Lebanon, just across Israel's northern border, Israeli troops and their Christian militia allies fired flares and conducted searches overnight to try to close the route Palestinian guerrillas used to enter Israel on Tuesday and Wednesday, a U.N. official said.

Soldiers and militiamen of the Israeli-backed South Lebanon Army set up roadblocks and questioned hundreds of Lebanese in the search for collaborators, said the official, speaking on condition of anonymity. The militia is the army's surrogate in the "security zone" Israel maintain north of the frontier.

Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir said Wednesday the two border crossings were an attempt at something

spectacular to spur the rebellion in the West Bank and Gaza, which Israel has occupied since the 1967 Middle East war. They led to firefights in which five guerrillas and two Israeli soldiers died.

Predictions of a calming in the territories followed several days of comparatively little violence, and Thursday's strike was generally peaceful.

Arabs blocked roads with wrecked cars and stones in several cities in Gaza and the West Bank, and taxi and bus stands were empty in east Jerusalem.

Death toll from Bhopal likely to reach 4,700

BHOPAL, India (AP) — More than 1,700 people likely will die in the next seven years from illnesses caused by the Bhopal gas leak, the 1984 disaster that already has killed nearly 3,000 people, a report said Thursday.

The predictions were contained in a \$285 million plan by the Madhya Pradesh state government for providing relief to both future and past Bhopal victims and their families.

The seven-year plan is based on a projected annual death rate of 250 people. Among those targeted for financial help are 509 women widowed by the tragedy and 27 orphans, the state report said.

The world's worst industrial disaster already has killed at least 2,988

people, the report said, a figure higher than the previously reported death toll of 2,800.

It said the deaths were "conclusively attributed" to the effects of the toxic methyl-isocyanate gas that was released on Dec. 3, 1984, from a plant owned by a pesticide subsidiary of the Union Carbide Corp., based in Danbury, Conn.

The central Indian state's study said another 816 deaths were being investigated for links to the gas leak.

The Indian government has said in the past that it expected the death toll to rise, but Thursday's report was the first time it has detailed the anticipated scope of the casualties.

Hirohito delivers birthday message

TOKYO (AP) — Emperor Hirohito, who celebrates his 87th birthday on Friday, says he feels well after intestinal surgery and needs years more to finish research in marine biology, his favorite hobby.

The world's longest-reigning monarch said he had replanted an endangered plant species on the palace grounds and "it is growing well because the imperial garden is similar to forest land."

During a news conference marking his birthday, a national holiday, the emperor said World War II was his "most unpleasant memory" and urged the Japanese to pursue peace.

He said he has felt fine since undergoing surgery in September to bypass an obstruction in his intestine.

The remarks were carried in Japanese by the Kyodo News Service and translated by The Associated Press.

The annual news conference, reduced from its usual 30 minutes to 15 because of concern about the emperor's health, took place Monday but the reports were not released until his birthday.

"I have recovered well," he said. "Since the beginning of April, I have been visiting the palace and a biological laboratory almost every day."







The best gainer on Thursday's active list was Lucky Stores, up 5 1/2% at 61 1/2 on volume of more than 3.3 million shares. The company, which has been resisting the takeover advances of American Stores, said it agreed to a \$61-a-share buyout by a New York investment firm.

That's not to enrich the insurance companies," he adds. "It's based on the increasing severity of jury awards in personal injury lawsuits. With that level of coverage, you have a chance in court."

Harvey Seymour, spokesman for the Insurance Information Institute (an industry group), suggests that drivers consider auto liability coverage of \$100,000/300,000 and \$25,000.

Sun Valley arranges modern China glimpse

Ranging from art to food,
these events will enlighten

SUN VALLEY — China. A land of a billion people. A land of Communist control. A land leaning towards capitalism. A land of mystery.

With help from the Sun Valley Center for the Arts and Humanities, local residents will have the opportunity to experience the Chinese culture so vastly different from ours.

Beginning May 6, the Sun Valley Center celebrates the Year of the Dragon with a month-long exhibit and special events calendar focused on the many fascinating aspects of China and her people.

Highlighting the in-depth examination of China is a special performance of the skilled and highly acclaimed Peking Acrobats. A gallery showing of photographic works of the traditional and modern China will be presented, as well as three lectures and slide presentations. A Chinese cooking class will offer a true taste of this ancient country.

Peking

Acrobats

The Peking Acrobats is the final event culminating the China celebration, but their notoriety and excellence gives merit to trumpeting this event first.

The troupe of 25 tumblers, contortionists, jugglers, cyclists and gymnasts will bring their 2,000-year-old tradition of acrobatics to the Wood River Valley.

The performance will take place May 17 at 7:30 p.m. in the Wood River High School auditorium in Hailey. Admission is \$18 for all front center seats. General admission is \$12 for adults and \$6 for young people, with a \$2 discount for adults and a \$1 discount for young people for Sun Valley Center members.

The Peking Acrobats are completing their third North American tour, having played to sold-out houses and earning rave reviews.

"The Peking Acrobats regularly passed from the seemingly impossible to the virtually unbelievable," wrote one critic in the Los Angeles Times.

This ability to perform the astounding is rooted in centuries of Chinese history and folk art. A bit of the historical background of acrobatics helps put into perspective the skills and techniques which have been passed down through the centuries.

Records of acrobatic acts can be found as early as the Ch'in Dynasty (225-207 B.C.). According to Fu Qieng, author of "Chinese Acrobatics Through the Ages," acrobatics originated from people's daily life, drawing from their experience in work, war and sacrificial rites.

The Chinese believed practicing acrobatics could strengthen the people's will and increase their physical

strength and the accuracy of their movements.

During the Han Dynasty (206 B.C.-220 A.D.), acrobatics flourished, and the wide variety of juggling, tumbling and magic acts came to be known as the "Hundred Entertainments." It was at this time that Emperor Wu Di of Han presented the first grand acrobatic performance at the Imperial Court, according to Fu Qieng.

Wu Di invited a number of important foreign dignitaries, thus making this performance the first time in Chinese history that acrobatic art was presented for diplomatic purposes. The foreign guests were so impressed by what they saw they agreed to enter into military alliances with the Han Emperor.

Today, professional acrobatic troupes travel throughout China, bringing their own unique costumes, stage props and acrobatic styles to factories, villages, army units, remote areas and frontier outposts. Many of these areas also have their own amateur groups which perform at festivals and on holidays. Some have consistently given performances for the past 20 to 30 years.

Thus, a performance by the Peking Acrobats brings with it the opportunity to view the epitome of a rich and ancient folk art tradition. There is nothing staid or stodgy about this tradition, though. As the Seattle Times stated, "Nearly everything the Peking Acrobats did last night was amazing, and stunning, and breathtaking, and WOW!"

Gallery Exhibit

As part of the China celebration, the Sun Valley Center Gallery will feature a month-long exhibit of the works of two outstanding photographers.

A rare anthology of photographs from the Hiroji Kubota Exhibition, "The Land and People of China," will be presented. Kubota, one of the best-known contemporary Japanese photographers, has been given a carte blanche opportunity to photograph China by the government.

Displayed with Kubota's traditional images will be photographs of photojournalist Ben Fernandez, faculty member of The New School for Social Research in New York City.

The Center Gallery has also acquired a wide variety of Chinese artifacts and artwork from contemporary Chinese artists, private collectors, the Idaho State Historical Museum, and oriental rug and Asian artifact merchants from throughout the state.

Ivory figurines, porcelain hats, pillows, Ju-I (Chinese scepters), jade and amber pieces, an imperial dragon robe from the 1800s, a Tibetan saddle, ancient carvings and rugs are all ex-



Is it possible? No more Magnum?

Only one thought consoles me with the imminent end of the "Magnum, P.I." epic Sunday night: I don't believe it.

For umpteen years now, I've watched Thomas Sullivan Magnum rise like a phoenix after he's been shot, drowned, hit by cars, crashed into, bashed in, pushed off cliffs, betrayed from helicopters, blown up on boats, dropped by male and female friends, incarcerated in prisons and dungeons and Vietnamese tiger cages, banished by Higgins, tortured, transported away on rampart nightmares and even bored to death by Higgins' stories.

So it seems logical that this is Not the End. Somewhere, surely, Robin Masters (alias

Jonathan Higgins) will still be chronicling the unlikely adventures of the eternal adventurer, the man who is loyal to his friends even though he never settles up his tab, and who accepts no responsibilities (including growing up) except the ones of life and death and the obligation to entertain.

In its way, the "Magnum" series is the penultimate cliff-hanger, the ultimate who-dun-it, because nothing is what it seems. The twists and turns of the plots are as hair-breadth as the mad car chases. But it's never what you expect.

In a curjags sort of way, after you've watched the illusion that for that brief hour once a week during the season (once a day if you're so truly addicted you have to watch the reruns), you become Magnum or his alter ego. Perhaps that's the se-

cret of the show. Magnum's voice-over monologue seems to become your own. It's not that you know Magnum; it's that you are he.

So you feel fear at his dangers, embarrassment at his short-changing his friends, love for his beauties, and humiliation at his failures. He lets you into the life you would lead if you had a perfect male body, a sensitive woman's understanding and a superhuman instinct for survival.

Magnum reassures us that no matter how fearsome the burglar, the enemy, the boss or even the lover, we can stand up and walk away. With, of course, a little help from our friends.

The play between Magnum and Higgins, portrayed by John Hillerman, is itself an essential ingredient. Sherlock Holmes to Dr. Watson, Boswell to Samuel Johnson, Nero Wolfe to Archie, Kirk to

Continued from Page D1 Spock, all are precedents to the characters' love-hate, independence-dependence, respect-contempt for each other. The sparks that fly between the two provide the electricity that lights up the plot.

And there is the Higgins riddle — Is he Robin Masters or no? — that gradually insinuated itself into the show like a glitch into a computer program. It is one of the more engaging of the suspenseful plots that hold the show together.

The supporting parts — the buddies, the long-suffering friends who are willing to put up with Magnum's long-running tabs and Higgins' snobbery — certainly are there when they are needed.

Roger E. Mosley as T.C. seems to have a more complete history, not to say family, than Larry Manetti as Rick, but they both serve as catalysts to the action and save the day when all else fails.

The orbits of the other characters, especially of costar Higgins, is a fine device to prevent too much of a Magnum. It's possible to become surfeited with a magnum of champagne, so you need a few nuts to salt your thirst.

And nuts the show has plenty of. The small parts are so often jewel-like that no wonder well-known actors and actresses are willing to play them, from Peter Davison ("Dr. Who" in another TV life) to dancer-actress Gwen Verdon, who plays Magnum's mother, and the eternal Elisha Cook Jr. who plays, sharp as his name, Ikepick.

And some less familiar have created memorable roles: the physical therapist who trains Magnum for the endurance race, the woman who memorizes the code of the ultimate weapons, the little girl who may or may not be Magnum's daughter, the girl from the rodeo with the rare, believable Southern accent and, of course, Higgins' devoted Agatha.

Even the many lady lovers are, amazingly, often real characters, not just figs and legs: the California detective, the beauty who preferred Higgins to Magnum if only to betray him, the woman who is murdered in one life and threatened in another and the lethal airline hostess, to name a few.

The show is remarkable in this day and time of offenses, such as "The Slap Maxwell Story," in its understanding of women, blacks, Indians, Hawaiians, Vietnamese, British, dogs, Southerners, Latins and many other non-white-male sensibilities. It's one of the few shows other than "Frank's Place" where you can even hear occasionally an authentic Southern accent.

Yes, the show is even an equal-opportunity employer for dogs. Surely The Lads, Zeus and Apollo — or is it Apollo and Zeus? — are to television what Rin-Tin-Tin was to old movies. A more intelligent, better trained, more beautifully mannered pair has never romped through television. There are viewers who tune in primarily to admire the dogs, and who count the episode a failure if they don't appear.

Slick films highlight week's local offerings

The following are capsule reviews of some of the films playing locally in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

colors. This is not a shabby, embarrassing film, but it is the work of an intelligent director who cannot think his way into what his film needs: passion.

COLORS (R). With its violent drive-by shootings and its daytime shots of grade-schoolers dealing crack, "Colors" may be like a bloody slice of the 11 o'clock news. But make no mistake, it is a movie and — for all its swirling motion and authentic look — a disappointingly superficial one at that. A superb performance by Robert Duvall as the older of a pair of cops who try to control the gang chaos — is whittled down to soap-opera size, undercutting everything. Also stars Sean Penn.

BEETLEJUICE (PG). Upstairs ghost comedy that is a dazzling display of the paid and unpaid silliness of director Tim Burton, director of "Pee-wee's Big Adventure." Alec Baldwin and Geena Davis are a ghostly New England couple who seek help from scuzzy "bio-exorcist" Michael Keaton to rid their home of an awful upstate Manhattan couple (Jeffrey Jones, Catherine O'Hara). With Winona Ryder, Sylvia Sidney, Dick Cavett, Robert Gould.

BILUXI BLUES (PG-13). In Neil Simon's autobiographical play, he recalls his life and hard times as an Army recruit in 1945 in Biloxi, Miss., and, as filmed by director Mike Nichols, the movie has marvelous moments and thoroughly engaging performances by Matthew Broderick and company. Nichols seems to have perfect pitch when he's working with Simon. He does not punch the jokes the way other directors do; he picks-up the laughs on the way to something else — and he also gives the story a baroque visual style: mixing Norman Rockwell with Orson Welles and George Stevens. It becomes a darkly nostalgic, wisecracking male bonding comedy, with moments of honest pain and eerie romanticism.

BRIGHT LIGHTS, BIG CITY (R). How could a movie made from the funny-frightening novel have botched out this spectacularly? While director James Bridges is a capital stylist, the film needed a great deal more than style. And star Michael J. Fox — as the film-novel's self-destructive protagonist — is puppyish and charming, but it is absolutely impossible to believe him at any point in the film. The picture might have had a chance with co-star Kiefer Sutherland in Fox's role; both he and Tracy Zellman are fine, and so are Diana West and Jason Robards in what amount to



amples of what will be on display during the month-long Chinese exhibit.

The Center begins its celebration with an opening reception at their gallery in the Walnut Avenue Mall on May 6 from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. Local students of Tae Kwan Do, Karate and Tai Chi conduct demonstrations throughout the evening. Chinese hors d'oeuvres prepared by chef Chris Kastner of the Evergreen Restaurant will be served as well.

Lectures

Two top professionals will speak about their experiences in China, while another will localize the topic with a history of the Chinese people in Idaho.

On May 10 at 7 p.m. at the Center Gallery, Arthur Hart, Director Emeritus of the Idaho State Historical Society, author of eight books and hundreds of articles on Western History, will give a lecture and slide presentation on "The Chinese in Early Idaho." The presentation is free of charge.

The first wave of immigration from China to Idaho began in the mid-1800s, primarily from the Kuang-Tung province. The immigrants came to make their fortunes and then return to China, but most remained.

By 1870, more than half of all miners in Idaho were Chinese. Most of the immigrants lived in Pierce, Newsome, Elk City, Florence, Warren, Lemhi, Deadwood, Idaho City, Alturas, Boise and Silver City.

Hart, past director of the Idaho State Museum, has been very involved in Idaho Chinese history. It was his interest which prompted him to take an active lead in salvaging what remained of Boise's Chinatown, demolished by urban renewal in the early 1970s.

Following Hart's presentation, on May 12 at 7:30 p.m. at the Center Gallery, Ben Fernandez, chairman of the Photography Department at the Parson School of Design and faculty member of The New School for Social Research in New York City, will speak and give a slide presentation on "A Photojournalist's Perception of China Following the Cultural Revolution."

Fernandez has traveled extensively throughout the world. The Center exhibit will show the work he did while living and teaching in Beijing shortly after the Cultural Revolution.

His photos have been exhibited in more than 25 major one-man shows and are included in permanent collections in the Museum of Modern Art and the Smithsonian Institute. The

Fernandez' presentation is free of charge.

On May 14, Dr. Jim Morrissey of Stockton, Calif., and his daughter Catherine, will speak and show films about their adventures in China.

Morrissey is a well-known cardiothoracic surgeon who led an American expedition to the top of Mount Everest, the world's tallest peak.

Morrissey's daughter Catherine is a teacher, linguist and an adventurer in her own right. The Morrisseys will speak at the Horizon Room at Elkhorn Resort at 7:30 p.m. Admission for this program will be \$3 general admission or \$2 for Center members.

The Community Programs component of the China Exhibit begins May 9 with a Chinese cooking class taught by Chris Kastner, chef from the Evergreen Restaurant in Ketchum. China Exhibit, a series of special events geared toward a better understanding of this country across the sea.

Fernandez made a brief visit to Canton, the capital of Guangdong province in southern China, in 1973, one year after President Richard M. Nixon visited Peking. Then, in 1982, Fernandez spent six weeks teaching photojournalism in Peking — called Beijing in Chinese — and traveled to various other cities and areas of the country.

Teaching without the knowledge of the Chinese language, Fernandez laughingly notes, made the first few days "very difficult." Over his six-

week teaching stint, he went through two translators due to his heavy New York accent.

Fernandez was interviewed by the Times-News this week, at the end of a hectic day at The New School for Social Research in New York City where he teaches. He briefly shared some of the insights he gained from teaching and traveling through China six years ago, but promised to share more of his experiences during a free lecture and slide presentation on May 12 at the Sun Valley Center Gallery.

Fernandez says for every five people on earth, there is one Chinese person. That equates to five Chinese for every one American.

"There's a lot we can learn from them," Fernandez says.



After 8 seasons, it's on to bigger things for 'Magnum P.I.' co-stars

With a look that exuded sexiness and sophistication and a vulnerability that carried over off-screen, Tom Selleck made a significant impression on television audiences when he arrived on the scene in 1980 in the role of Hawaiian private eye Thomas Sullivan Magnum, on "Magnum, P.I."

As the most laid-back detective ever to grace the small screen, he displayed a style that quickly elevated him into becoming one of prime time's favorite stars. But he never hesitated to attribute the success of "Magnum, P.I." to the work of his co-stars, John Hillerman (Higgins), Larry Manetti (Rick) and Roger E. Mosley (T.C.). His generosity paid off. During "Magnum's" lengthy run, there has never been the faintest rumor of discord on the set, nor have his co-stars expressed the customary desire to leave the hit series and move on to "bigger and better things."

But now, after eight seasons on the exotic shores of the Aloha State, "Magnum, P.I." moves to a new locale for an emotional closing, when it airs its last original episode on Sunday, May 1 on CBS. The special two-hour finale, titled "Resolutions," will feature appearances by 18 guest stars, all of whom created roles during the series run.

In this episode, Magnum returns to the nation's capital, both for a visit home and to attend the 20th reunion of his U.S. Naval Academy class in nearby Annapolis, Md. But the sentimental journey back East creates confusion in Magnum's life, when the reunion starts him reconsidering a life in the Navy away from Hawaii. He finds himself facing a difficult choice — returning to Hawaii or to the Navy. Eight seasons is an enviable run for

any series, but "Magnum's" success hasn't always come easy. During the 1984-85 season, "The Cosby Show" was scheduled opposite "Magnum," and the hit series suddenly dropped out from its top 10 position in the rat-

ings to the low 30s. In the fall of 1986, CBS moved the series to Wednesdays, opposite another stiff competitor, ABC's "Dynasty." Rumors that the show was a possible cancellation candidate persisted, and Selleck, himself, was ready for the end. "Limbo," last

season's final episode, featured Magnum's untimely death. But the surprising success of the once-thought-dead series against a tired "Dynasty" caused CBS to reconsider. Magnum's demise was altered to a "near death experience," and life was pumped once more into "Magnum, P.I."

But this year, "Magnum" will truly come to a close. And after a deserved rest, its stars will look to the future.

For Selleck, who finally scored in a big-screen hit — the \$100 million plus grossing "Three Men and a Baby" — it's time to make that serious move toward a movie career. He's currently considering a "Three Men" sequel. And there's Broadway. A role in "Mister Roberts" may materialize in the fall of 1989. And he hasn't ruled out returning in an occasional "Magnum" special.

For Hillerman, it's time to negotiate for a series of his own. A possible "Magnum" spinoff has been discussed for Manetti. He must re-establish himself in Hollywood after an eight-year absence while he was doing the series.
