Authorities name suspect in slaying

TWIN FALLS — Police suspect Jesse Ray Jaggers of killing Virginia Westergren based upon a trail of clues that starts with a hand-drawn map linking Idaho and Mexico. The map, drawn on the back of a piece of paper listing college prerequisite courses, was found by police in a kitchen trash can at the Westergren home. "I am sick of this s---," said handwriting on the map. A straight line was drawn from Idaho to a Mexico destination. Jaggers' younger brother Ray told police he had previously seen the paper in the hotel room where Jaggers was staying, according to court records. He also identified the handwriting as that of his brother.

Chief Tim Qualls said police expect to obtain an arrest warrant today for Jaggers, a Twin Falls man whose 18th birthday fell two weeks before the May 13 slaying. Court documents filed Thursday include a patchwork of additional evidence. Jaggers knew the Westergren family from doing yard work at their Buchanan Street home, according to court records. Westergren's husband, Al, told police that Jaggers last worked at the house May 9. Two men who Las Vegas police arrested in Westergren's stolen car said they bought the car from Jaggers. The gray Buick Century was presumably stolen by Westergren's killer. Court documents also outline a history of violence by Jaggers, including incidents in which he allegedly threatened his grandmother with a knife and his brother with a

screwdriver. While a juvenile living in New Mexico, Jaggers was charged with aggravated assault and false imprisonment. He was accused of threatening a hostage with a screwdriver. Police Wednesday searched the Cactus Inn room where Jaggers had been staying. They seized various items of clothing, including shirts, pants and a hat. Twin Falls County Prosecutor K. Ellen Baxter said police found "nothing that would obviously connect those clothes to this crime." She said no blood was found on the clothes, which were sent to a laboratory for testing. In an affidavit supporting the search warrant, investigators said the killer probably could not have avoided getting blood stains on his clothing and body. Staff members at Buhl Junior High School

said Jaggers attended their school before transferring, apparently to New Mexico. Several of Jaggers' relatives live in Twin Falls, including his mother, a brother and grandmother. Jaggers left the Cactus Inn a few days ago, owner Gertrude Sabey said. He was living alone in room number one, and owners of the Kimberly Road motel said they were planning to evict him because of overdue rent. Jaggers worked at the Twin Falls-Sears store, according to court records. He rode a green bicycle, which he apparently left at the motel. Family members told police they last saw Jaggers May 11. On that date Jaggers threatened to strike his brother with a screwdriver and told him he would make him pay for his

Jury finds Lehder guilty of trafficking

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — Carlos Lehder Rivas, reputedly a leader of a violent Colombian drug cartel responsible for most of the cocaine imported to this country, was convicted Thursday of smuggling more than three tons of cocaine into the United States. The verdict capped a seven-month trial on a federal indictment charging him with taking over the island of Norman's Cay in the Bahamas to smuggle cocaine into Florida and Georgia from 1978 to 1980. "This is truly a major victory in the war on drugs," said U.S. Attorney Robert Merkle, the lead prosecutor. Authorities say Lehder, 38, is a key figure in the Medellín Cartel, responsible for up to 80 percent of U.S. cocaine imports, and Merkle said the case threatens the cartel's operations. "I would say they are looking over their shoulders," Merkle said. "I think their days are numbered."

But Lehder's attorney, Edward Shohat, said the conviction, "sadly, means nothing at all." He accused the government of creating hysteria, even convincing jurors their security was threatened. He promised an appeal. Drug Enforcement Administration spokesman Jack Hook called the operation the world's largest drug trafficking ring. By comparison, authorities say the French Connection drug ring smuggled in about 70 pounds of heroin from 1968 to 1971. "This conviction sends a message to the kingpins of the cartel — you are not able to bribe, intimidate or murder your way out of custody in the United States," Hook said. "It has been a tradition in Colombia, but not in the United States." In Bogota, Colombia, Attorney General Horacio Serpa Uribe said, "Everyone in Colombia was hoping for a guilty verdict." He declined further comment, saying only, "I understand what you are saying." • See LEHDER on Page A2

Grand jury indicts 2 following threat

ST. LOUIS — A man who says he is prejudiced "against anything that is white" was indicted by a federal grand jury Thursday on a charge of threatening to kill black presidential candidate Jesse Jackson. Londell Williams, 30, of Washington, Mo., was named in all four counts of the indictment. His wife, Tammy, 27, was named in three of the counts. The indictment said that on or about May 10 Williams "knowingly and willfully did threaten to kill and inflict bodily harm upon Jesse Jackson." The indictment charges both of the Williamses with possessing an AR-15 rifle that had been altered to make it fully automatic. That gun has been identified by the government as the weapon that was to be used in a plot to kill Jackson. The pair were charged with two counts of threatening to harm a government informant in retaliation. The indictment said the Williamses

used intimidation and threats of physical harm on an informant "with the intent to hinder, delay and prevent the communication of information relating to the possible commission of a federal offense." Williams, a construction worker and laborer, faces a maximum penalty of three years in prison and \$250,000 in fines on the first count. On each of the other three counts, the Williamses can be sentenced to 10 years in prison and fined \$250,000. In an interview Wednesday at a federal detention center in Belleville, Ill., across the Mississippi River from St. Louis, Williams denied conspiring to kill Jackson and said that although he sympathized with white supremacists, he did not belong to any extremist group. "I deny that there is a crime done," he said. "I did not conspire with anyone to kill any presidential candidate. I do have prejudices — against anything that isn't white," Williams said. But he added regarding Jackson: "If the man makes it to president, more power to him."

Students scarce while strike continues

MOUNTAIN HOME — Only 37 percent of the students at five Mountain Home schools reopened Thursday returned to class as most of the district's 209 teachers continued their increasingly bitter strike into a seventh day. "The hardest day that many of the teachers had was watching their students go into the classroom and they couldn't be there," said Neil Hilleland, president of the Mountain Home Education Association. "It's hard on everybody, and I'm not sure how much longer the community can go this way." Substitute teachers, teacher's aides and the 31 regular teachers that crossed picket lines Wednesday under a back-to-work order staffed classrooms on Thursday. Vicky Brumman, administrative secretary for the Mountain Home School District, said 769 of the

2,088 students enrolled at the five reopened schools reported for class. The district's total enrollment is about 3,600 students. The school day lasted four hours, the minimum required under state law to qualify as a day of instruction. Mountain Home's three other schools remained closed Thursday, but Ms. Brumman said all but Mountain Home High School would be open for four hours on Friday. Classes would begin as regularly scheduled in the morning and last until 1:30 p.m., she said. Administrators said they realized classes would not be full at the five reopened schools, but trustee David Humphery said the turnout ranging from 17 percent at Air Base Primary to 47 percent at North Elementary was a "good sign." "I hoped they'd all be back, but I think that probably tomorrow we'll see more coming back," Humphery said. "I think a lot of parents held

their children out the first day just to wait and see." The school board on Wednesday decided to begin discharge proceedings against teachers who continue the walkout. Humphery said the board would send out dismissal notices to teachers who did not show up for work, and hearings would be conducted May 31. "There's a lot of disappointment there," Hilleland said. "A lot of us have spent many years in Mountain Home and there's just disappointment that the board would do something like this." But despite the threat of dismissal, he said he had not detected any further sign of teachers breaking ranks with the union. "The unity that we have seen over the last four or five days is continuing to grow and I believe that everybody is very dedicated to solving this, and then going back to the classrooms," Hilleland said.

Drop in accidents accompanies rise in Idaho drinking age

BOISE — Alcohol-related traffic accidents among Idaho's youth have dropped, along with sales of beer, wine and hard liquor, in the year since the state's legal drinking age was raised from 19 to 21. "And while some bars and taverns — primarily those near colleges and along state borders — have suffered, the 1987 Legislature's decision to phase 19- and 20-year-olds out of the legal drinking community so far has not had the dire economic consequences opponents predicted. Even while it seems to be having the positive effect supporters forecast, there remains a

general lack of enthusiasm for the change lawmakers swallowed hard to adopt under the threatened loss of millions of dollars in highway funds many called "federal blackmail." "I voted for it mostly because I came to the conclusion that it was a wise thing to do," said state Rep. Dean Haugenson, R-Coeur d'Alene. "But I don't buy the argument that because it's for our own good blackmail is acceptable, and forgive me if I don't believe that every 19- and 20-year-old has stopped drinking." If not stopped, certainly most have changed their drinking venues. Detractors contend many of the drinkers who were not at least 19 by the April 11, 1987, cutoff under a grandfather clause in the law have taken their act on

the road or to other "uncontrolled environments." "And I think a logical argument can be made that you're probably less likely to have serious things happen with somebody going into Peabody's or the Cotton Club than with somebody going to a kegger out in the gravel pit," Haugenson said. But at least statistically, the higher drinking age seems to be working. Patricia Raino, alcohol safety specialist with the Idaho Department of Transportation's Division of Highway Safety, said alcohol-related accidents from April through December 1987 were down 11 percent from the same period a year earlier. For drivers 17 through 21, the

drop was almost 17 percent. Even more telling, Raino said, was that 17-year-old drivers had more than 26 percent and 18-year-old drivers almost 29 percent fewer alcohol-related accidents. The 17-year-olds were 20 percent and the 18-year-olds 18 percent less "over-involved" in alcohol-related accidents than a year earlier, in proportion to all licensed drivers. Although the higher drinking age had no direct effect on those drivers, it did put the squeeze on the 19- and 20-year-olds who had been buying booze for their younger friends, Raino said. "Since almost half of those who fell under the grandfather clause are still under 21, the full

impact of the change on drunken-driving rates has not yet been felt. And experts agree there has been an increase in awareness among all age groups about the dangers of driving drunk, or drinking at all. But the age decline is given some of the credit for a decline in beer, wine and liquor sales. The Idaho Tax Commission reports that more than 1.3 million fewer gallons of beer and 107,423 fewer gallons of wine were sold from April through December of last year than during the same period in 1986. That amounted to decreases of 7 percent and 6 percent, respectively. • See DRINK on Page A2

Consumers testify in surcharge hearing

BOISE (AP) — Two people representing consumers urged the Idaho Public Utilities Commission here Thursday to reject Idaho Power Company's proposal for a 13 percent surcharge for the next 12 months.

"Don't do it to us," said Barbara Smyth, representing the Idaho Hunger Action Council.

She was joined by Gary Sandusky, executive director of the Idaho-Neighbors Network. He argued that an across-the-board rate increase has a disproportionately heavy impact on low-income families.

The PUC listened to the testimony Thursday afternoon in the second day of hearings on an Idaho Power request for a one-year surcharge, which would generate \$41 million. It would add \$7.20 per month to the bill of an average residential customer using 7,200 kilowatt-hours of electricity.

The PUC hopes to wind up testimony Friday and issue a decision by the end of the day.

Chairman Robert O'Connor and other company officials contend that because of drought conditions the last two years, its cost of generating electricity has gone up and sales of surplus power have dropped sharply.

A competing staff proposal would cost only 88 cents per month. Staff witnesses said its calculations showed the utility needs only \$5 million more per year, 1.6 percent.

Several intervenors, mainly some of Idaho Power's largest customers, contend the utility doesn't need a rate increase.

Demis Pasant testified for the 18-member Industrial Customers of Idaho Power, made up of some of the utility's largest industrial buyers.

He said his calculations showed that in good water years, 1982-86, Idaho Power collected more revenue than authorized under normal water conditions. The accumulative excess was \$114 million, he said.

Last year's drought cut Idaho Power revenue by \$58 million, Pasant said, but that still left enough of a surplus to cover its shortfall this year and even 1989, he said.

Staff auditor Terri Carlock contended it is not necessary to abandon normal rate-making procedures by allowing the surcharge. She said it would be adequate to update the process with current streamflows and other information.

Ms. Carlock contended the company can borrow to cover its usual \$1.80 per share dividend on common stock.

Staff Utility Engineer Keith Hensing said it is not necessary to impose an emergency surcharge because of water conditions. He said 1988 water conditions are expected to be within the range used for normal ratemaking.

Jury selection begins in Mecham trial

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP) — Former Gov. Evan Mecham, removed from office last month by impeachment conviction, went on trial Thursday on criminal charges of concealing a \$350,000 campaign loan.

About 100 prospective jurors were sworn in during the brief opening session at Maricopa County Superior Court. Mecham did not attend.

"I haven't broken any laws," he said Wednesday. "I looked at the laws. My attorney looked at the laws. We've had experts look at the laws. We haven't broken any of them."

Mecham and his brother and 1986 campaign treasurer, Willard Mecham, are charged with perjury, willful concealment and filing false documents for failing to report a \$350,000 campaign loan from a developer.

Mecham, 64, could face up to 22 years in prison if convicted of all six felony counts. His brother could be sentenced to up to 9½ years if convicted of the three counts he faces.

The former governor's attorney, Michael Scott, said Mecham probably will attend court sessions next week, after the pool of prospective jurors is narrowed and questioning of individuals begins.

"Please do not withhold any information in order to be seated on this jury," Ryan told the prospective jurors.

Mecham speech canceled

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP) — Former Gov. Evan Mecham, barred from speaking at Brigham Young University because of a morality and honesty clause that limits public speakers, says he's unfazed by the decision.

"I don't get too upset about anything," Mecham said Wednesday. "It was just a group of young Republicans who wanted me to speak. If they have a policy, they have a policy, and I won't speak."

"We haven't decided that Evan Mecham is guilty, but now is not the appropriate time for him to appear on campus," said Brent Harker, a university spokesman.

"We do not allow to speak on campus people who are not worthy examples," said Brad Hanesworth, a communications professor who is the Campus Republicans' faculty adviser. "I thought it was clear that he did not meet the criteria" on which speakers may appear at BYU.

Phone costs may change

BOISE (AP) — If the Idaho Public Utilities Commission approves, some Mountain Bell costs will be shifted from long-distance to local telephone service for an overall 3-percent drop in toll rates and a 5.4-percent hike in local charges.

The company has asked the PUC's permission to reduce in-state long-distance rates by \$2.9 million effective

July 1. The actual percentage of the rate cut for each customer would vary depending on the distance of calls, but would average about 3 percent, the commission said.


The costs shift, brought on by accounting and allocation changes, would raise local rates \$4.3 million effective Jan. 1. The increase would not apply to custom calling, local pay phone or Centron charges.

Payette study permit granted

BOISE (AP) — The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission has granted the Gem Irrigation District of Homedale and its two partners, Western Power Inc. and the city of Tacoma, Wash., a permit to study the feasibility of building a hydroelectric project on the North Fork of the Payette River.

"It takes (FERC) such a long time you wonder if you're ever going to get it," said Thurmond Blake, vice president for Western Power.

Western Power, which is seeking to build an intertie powerline to the Southwest, is the project's main financier, backed by industrialist J.R. Simplot.

North's testimony may be evidence

WASHINGTON (AP) — Many statements Oliver L. North made to Congress about the Iran-Contra affair — including his admission that he shredded documents — can be used as evidence against him, prosecutors said Thursday in court papers.

Even though they testified on Capitol Hill under limited grants of immunity from prosecution, former National Security Council aide North, former national security adviser John M. Poindexter and arms dealer Albert Hakim made statements that can be

used against them when the Iran-Contra case goes to trial in federal court, the prosecution said.

"Volunteered testimony by defendants in their congressional testimony is not immunized and may be directly introduced at trial against them," independent counsel Lawrence E. Walsh said in briefs filed in U.S. District Court.

The three defendants are accused along with retired Air Force Maj. Gen. Richard V. Secord, who gave congressional testimony without an immunity grant, of conspiring to defraud the government by diverting profits from the U.S.-Iran arms sales to the Nicaraguan rebels.

The indictment includes charges that North destroyed documents during the November 1986 Justice Department investigation of the Iran-Contra affair that uncovered the diversion of arms-sale profits. It also accuses Poindexter and North of lying to congressional committees by denying involvement in private Contra resup-

ply efforts.

Walsh offered to "forego the use of congressional testimony" to smooth the way for a quick trial as a way of satisfying defense complaints that the prosecution illegally relied on immunized statements of the defendants.

However, Walsh cited numerous examples of statements by North, Poindexter and Hakim that were either voluntary or not responsive to the specific question posed by the committees and therefore not covered by the immunity grants.

These include North's statements to the Iran-Contra committees that he shredded National Security Council documents while Justice Department officials were in the next room, prosecutors said in the briefs.

"I remember shredding documents while they were in there reading documents," North told the committee.

"Do you remember — shredding them in their presence?" asked Arthur Liman, counsel for the Senate panel.

\$10 million earmarked to check peace process

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Reagan administration announced on Thursday approval of a \$10 million grant to monitor compliance with the Nicaraguan peace process and it used the occasion to launch a harsh attack on the Sandinista government.

The administrator of the Agency for International Development, Alan Woods, charged that Nicaragua had engaged in a campaign of "harassment and intimidation" and "menacing militarism" in apparent violation of agreements signed by Sandinista authorities.

Shortly after the announcement of the grant was made, House Speaker Jim Wright, D-Texas, criticized the administration for taking six weeks to

determine how to spend the funds. Other Democrats have made the same criticism.

The money was part of a \$48 million package approved by Congress in late March, a week after Nicaragua's leftist government and the Contra rebels signed a temporary truce at Sapoa, Nicaragua.

That agreement called for the creation of a verification commission to monitor compliance with the accord.

Woods said: "Anyone who shares our interest in peace, democracy and reconciliation in Nicaragua must be greatly alarmed by the recent crackdown on human rights and civil liberties by the Sandinista government."

Soviets raise official ire

WASHINGTON (AP) — A high-ranking State Department official on Thursday criticized plans by retreating Soviet forces to leave up to \$1 billion in equipment and facilities for the Kabul government, and reaffirmed the U.S. intention to continue backing the Afghan rebels.

"There have been indications that we have picked up that the intention of the Soviets to turn over equipment and facilities will be on a fairly large scale," said Michael H. Armacost, undersecretary of state for political affairs.

"We've heard estimates ranging from a half a billion to \$1 billion worth of equipment and/or, installations and facilities," he added. "That

doesn't strike me as a demonstration of tremendous restraint."

He was referring to statements by Lt. Gen. Boris Gromov, the Soviet commander in Afghanistan, that the value of Soviet bases and equipment left behind after the withdrawal would be 800 million rubles, the equivalent of \$1 billion.

The Soviets rejected the offer, but the United States kept its promise on the table, saying it would match Soviet restraint with "symmetrical" reductions in aid to the mujahadeen.


INF debate to continue

WASHINGTON (AP) — Conservative Republicans, spurning appeals from the Senate's GOP and Democratic leaders, urged colleagues on Thursday to ignore the fast approaching U.S.-Soviet summit and debate the medium-range arms reduction treaty for weeks.

But Senate Republican leader Bob Dole of Kansas said: "It's our president who will be in Moscow next week and he'd like to have this treaty. I say that as Republican leader on behalf of a Republican president."

"We have a special responsibility to President Ronald Reagan," Dole said.

Shortly before Dole appealed to senators to bring any amendments they may have to the Senate floor for action, Sen. Malcolm Wallop, R-Wyo., told his colleagues: "We should not be playing beat the clock in our debate over the treaty."

Bus victims buried

RADCLIFF, Ky. (AP) — Anger and guilt but "no satisfying answers" remain for the families and friends of 27 people killed in a fiery bus crash, a priest said Thursday at the funeral for three of the victims.

Six of the dead were buried Thursday, all but one at the North Hardin Memorial Gardens graveyard that abuts the high school they would have graduated from one day.

Gov. Wallace Wilkinson declared a day of mourning, with flags at half-staff throughout the state.

"The saying is true but painfully true: They had their whole lives before them," said the Rev. Leo Craycroft during Mass at St. Christopher Church in Radcliff for Mary Catheryn Daniels, 14; Denise Ellen Voglund, 13, and Amy Christine Wheelock, 14.

Twenty-four children and three adults were killed Saturday night when a pickup truck traveling in the wrong direction on Interstate 71 struck a church bus, rupturing its fuel tank and setting it ablaze.

The crash occurred in Carroll County, 100 miles northeast of this Army post town, as the bus owned by Radcliff First Assembly of God church carried members of the church's youth group and their guests home from a day at the Kings Island amusement park north of Cincinnati. The driver of the truck allegedly was drunk.

A citywide memorial service for all the victims was scheduled Thursday night at the North Hardin High School football stadium.

"This is for the community," said the Rev. Gene Waggoner, pastor of Stithen Baptist Church in Radcliff, so that "they might grieve before they go their separate ways."

Mayor Joseph Hutcheson said it was hoped the service would "relieve some of the tension and the pain in the whole community."

Wilkinson and Maj. Gen. Thomas H. Tait, commander of nearby Fort Knox, were among those scheduled to attend the service.

Panamanian propaganda worries U.S.

PANAMA CITY, Panama (AP) — A pro-government newspaper published the names and photographs of U.S. Embassy personnel and their dependents Thursday, and accused them of "starting us to death."

The supplement in the newspaper Critica, which serves as a propaganda organ for the regime, said the Americans "think the walls of their embassy

are impregnable."

U.S. Embassy spokesmen said it was a significant escalation of what they called a harassment campaign by Gen. Manuel Antonio Noriega, who is chief of the Panama Defense Forces and controls the civilian government.

Noriega has been indicted on drug trafficking charges in the United States and the Reagan administration

has imposed severe economic sanctions on Panama in an effort to force him out.

A 10-foot-high fence of iron bars surrounds the grounds on Avenida Balboa Avenue and the embassy building is about 25 yards from the fence, within easy reach of projectiles from the street.

Its physical defenses are almost identical to those of the U.S. consulate in Tegucigalpa, Honduras, which anti-U.S. protesters burned and sacked last month.

"We take this seriously," embassy spokesman Terence Kneebone said in a telephone interview.

"Saying 'Panamanians, these are your enemies,' and putting it in a very

shrill way in front of a public in which there are known paramilitary groups is not a very wholesome thing to do. Combined with the rhetoric, it is cause for concern."

The front page of the 36-page supplement shows photographs of the embassy building, Ambassador Arthur Davis and John Maisto, deputy chief of mission. It says in bold print: "Panamanian: Know the Gringos who are starving us to death."

A preface to the list said: "These are the ones who think the walls of their embassy are impregnable, that their computers are infallible. These are the ones who carry out the strategy of Elliott Abrams, who wants to kill thousands of Panamanians."

Soviets admit losses

MOSCOW (AP) — The Soviet Union lost up to 15,000 soldiers in Afghanistan, a government media official said Thursday even as the first contingent of Red Army troops was arriving home from the eight-year war with Moslem guerrillas.

Novosti press agency political observer Eduard Rosental told reporters that a Western estimate of 12,000 to 15,000 deaths among Soviet soldiers during their 8½ years in Afghanistan was approximately correct.

It was the first time a Soviet official had given any indication of the size of Soviet losses in Afghanistan. Soviet officials have refused to specify the death toll or even the number of Soviet troops deployed there.

Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard A. Shevardnadze had indicated last month that casualty and troop strength figures would be released once the Kremlin began pulling its forces out of Afghanistan.

The withdrawal began Sunday, as required under a U.N.-mediated peace accord signed April 14 in Geneva. The first 1,300 Soviets to leave Afghanistan crossed the border into Termez in Soviet Uzbekistan on Wednesday.

Radio Moscow reported that the soldiers sent a message to President Reagan, urging him "to use America's prestige and your personal authority on behalf of this humane goal — that of bringing war in Afghanistan to an end and to ensure that no more bombs

fall, no more people die and no more children become invalids."

Foreign Ministry spokesman Gennady I. Gerasimov said Thursday that high-ranking Defense and Foreign ministry officials would meet with reporters next week to discuss Afghanistan.

Rosental was asked at a news conference how many Soviet soldiers died in Afghanistan over the course of the Soviet military involvement in the war between pro-Soviet government forces and anti-communist guerrillas armed and trained by Pakistan and the United States.

He reviewed various Western media assessments, including a report by Agence France Press stating that 12,000 to 15,000 Soviets had been killed in the war.

"I think the figures cited by Agence France-Presse are more or less correct, but you can obtain more correct figures from our military men," Rosental said.

A Soviet-inspired revolution in April 1978 brought a Marxist leadership to power in Afghanistan. The Kremlin sent troops and tanks in December 1979 to help the allied Kabul government fight U.S.-supplied guerrillas.

A State Department report released in December estimated the number of deaths and injuries among Soviets serving in Afghanistan since 1979 to be "at least 33,000 to 38,000," with at least a third of them fatalities.

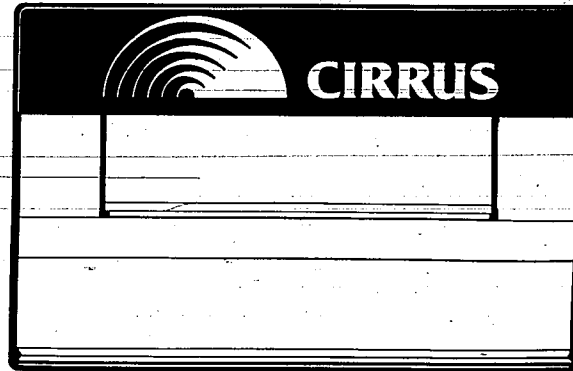
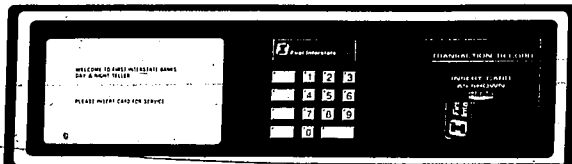

Shiites clash bloodily

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Rival Shiite Moslem militias battled each other with machine guns in the slums south of Beirut on Thursday, despite efforts by Syria and Iran to stop the two weeks of fighting.

Police said a man was killed and 10 people were injured in the clashes between the Iranian-backed Hezbollah and the pro-Syrian Amal.

The casualties brought the toll to 244 people killed and 772 wounded since fighting broke out May 6 for control of the slums, where Hezbollah-affiliated groups are believed to hold most of the 18 foreign hostages in Lebanon.

In Jerusalem, Vernon Walters, U.S. ambassador to the United Nations, said he will return to Syria on Friday on a mission to secure the release of the nine American hostages.

Walters declined to give details of his trip to Damascus. "When it comes to the hostages, the less you talk about what you plan to do the more you get done," he told The Associated Press.

Walters said his return was prompted by concern for the safety of the hostages as the fighting between Amal and Hezbollah escalated.

He also apparently is seeking Israel's assurances that it will not conduct raids into Lebanon against Hezbollah and thereby endanger the hostages.

The violent 'Colors' is disappointingly superficial

The following are capsule reviews of some of the films playing locally in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

COLORS (R). With its violent drive-by shootings and its daytime shots of grade-schoolers dealing crack, "Colors" may feel like a bloody slice of the 11 o'clock news. But make no mistake, it is a movie and — for all its swirling motion and authentic look — a disappointingly superficial one at that. A superb performance by Robert Duvall as the older of a pair of cops who try to control the gang chaos — is whittled down to soap-opera size, undercutting everything. Also stars Sean Penn.

BILOXI BLUES (PG-13). In Neil Simon's autobiographical play, he recalls his life and hard times as an Army recruit in 1945 in Biloxi, Miss., and, as filmed by director Mike Nichols, the movie has marvelous moments and thoroughly engaging performances by Matthew Broderick and company. Nichols seems to have perfect pitch when he's working with Simon. He does not punch the jokes the

way other directors do; he picks up the laughs on the way to something else — and he also gives the story a baroque visual style: mixing Norman Rockwell with Orson Welles and George Stevens. It becomes a darkly nostalgic, wisecracking male bonding comedy, with moments of honest pain and eerie romanticism.

SHAKEDOWN (R). Mindlessly enjoyable, great-looking escapist fare in which a courtroom drama is enlivened by some wholly improbable but spectacular stunts. Peter Weller stars as a

determined legal aid attorney who teams up with Manhattan undercover policeman Sam Elliott to go after a ring of corrupt cops.

STAND AND DELIVER (PG). This is not a perfect film — it really needs more textured writing and more complexity to the characters — but caught up in Edward James Olmos' electrifying performance as an equally electrifying high school math teacher, one may not notice. "Stand and Deliver" contains the thrill of watching closed minds unclench, of watching the diabolical intensity of the teacher who makes them blossom.

SUNSET (R). Blake Edwards' fanci-

ful account of a meeting between Tom Mix (Bruce Willis) and Wyatt Earp (James Garner) is both affectionate and valentine to the silent movie era and Raymond Chandleresque murder mystery: Rot swims under the candid backdrop. Unfortunately, Mix and Earp are dubious gumshoe-bud-

dies and Willis is an unsmiling, tense Mix (though Garner is splendid). Edwards' script is weak on dialogue, and he does not display his usual genius for physical comedy. There are nice things here, but often the sunset seems to have fallen on the movie as well as its subject.

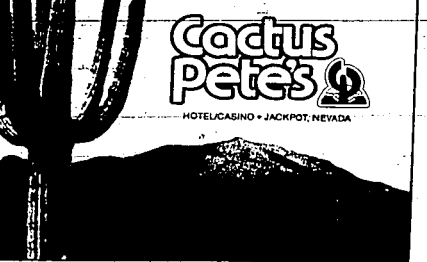

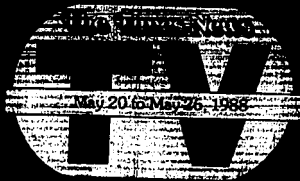

'Desperado: Avalanche at Devil's Ridge' marks Rod Steiger return

By PAUL ELIE

"Desperado: Avalanche at Devil's Ridge," an NBC movie airing Tuesday, May 24, is an unlikely setting for the return of Rod Steiger.

Like its predecessors, "Desperado" and "The Return of Desperado," this two-hour Western is a vehicle for would-be heartthrob Alex McArthur, who stars as cowboy Duell McCall. But for Steiger, one of the country's finest dramatic actors and an Oscar winner in 1967, it is a genre film — and a job.

"The film is an entertainment in the form of a straight-ahead Western, with the standard hero and heroine," he says. "I play a man named Slaten, who's the 'dictator' of the territory — he owns the mines. It's nice, a role I could do something with, and on the main network. And the money wasn't bad." Steiger, 63, was a star by age 30, after roles in "On the Waterfront" (1954), "The Court-Martial of Billy Mitchell" (1955) and "The Harder They Fall" (1956) established him as a practitioner of the intense style associated with "Waterfront" star Marlon Brando and director Elia Kazan. He played the title role in "Al Capone" (1959) and a supporting role in the World War II epic "The Longest Day" (1962), before making several films in Italy.

Then, the story goes, he refused unchallenging parts for 18 months before taking the demanding role of Holocaust survivor Sol Nazerman in Sidney Lumet's "The Pawnbroker" (1965). Now, though, he is happy just to be working.

"It was a step I took to solve psychological problems I had about acting," he says of the "Desperado" role. "I was at a point in my life when I was refusing everything. I was afraid to act. So I was happy I'd got a job. I wish I'd snapped out of it earlier — I would have saved a lot of money."

It is strange to see Steiger billed alongside actors who hadn't been born when he was nominated for an Oscar for "On the Waterfront": McArthur, who is best known as Madonna's boy-

friend in the video for "Papa Don't Preach," Lise Cutter, who played Susan Campbell on "Perfect Strangers," and Alice Adair.

"They were respectful, kind and considerate, very polite to me," he says. "And after a couple of days, when we got to be friends, they started to talk about 'Waterfront,' or 'In the Heat of the Night.' It was flattering."

The series version of "In the Heat of the Night," with Carroll O'Connor in the sheriff role that brought Steiger a Best Actor Oscar, has been a surprise hit for NBC — and a sore point for Steiger.

"I was upset that they didn't even give me a phone call to tell me they were doing it," he says. "I would have liked the courtesy of a call. But that's my childish imagination, mind you, a wishful fantasy."

"Desperado" finished filming in early November, and Steiger is now playing the mayor of New York in "January Man," an upcoming film written by John Patrick Shanley ("Moonstruck") and starring Kevin

Kline. But because of his age, roles are hard to come by.

"The trouble these days is that, by and large, the scripts sent around are for much younger actors," he explains. "You go from being the first-billed role to being the third-billed role. The best way to explain it is the way it's done in the world of sports — brutally."

"It is easier to hold on in acting, though," he admits. "They always need some older actors to fill roles."

He adds, "I have to adjust to being an older actor. It requires an adjustment-of-ego in which you say, 'It's their turn. You've just got to say, 'That's the way it is.'"

He feels that his work, at least, has not aged.

"Society's style of living changes, and doesn't match the style of living of say, 'The Ox-bow Incident.'"

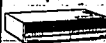

A: There's been a fair amount of speculation on that subject in Hollywood's music circles. After all, John — born 41 years ago as Reginald Dwight — is no youngster by rock performer standards. Also, we haven't heard much since Elton's throat operation. One insider, who got a hush-hush advance hearing of John's latest album, assures me that all is OK. John's voice is described as sounding much younger, and stronger.

Q: We hear that veteran actress Shelley Winters seriously injured herself while trying to perform a stunt in her latest movie. What's gotten into her? — P.W.

A: Shelley, who'll be 66 this year, isn't a Method actress for nothing. She threw herself so hard into her role in "The Order in Things," she wound up with a fairly serious back injury. Winters confessed she hurt herself in a fall — "I don't know how I finished the picture." She did, and she pronounces the slick "the best movie I've ever done."

Q: I saw some revealing pictures of Jacqueline Bisset, and can't help wondering how she keeps her well-proportioned figure in such great shape. Does she do a lot of weightlifting? — A.R.

A: Weightlifting adds muscular Friday, May 20, 1988

bulk, and Jacqueline tells me that's not her scene. Slender femininity is the image she projects. Bisset's "secret" is actually quite simple. She diets a lot. At one fancy Hollywood dinner, Jackie confessed that she was on a juice diet — "I haven't had any solid food for a week." During the dinner, she didn't eat, she said, but "sucked the tomato sauce off the penne noodles," a delightful Italian dish.

Q: An article about unlikely singing combinations cited Julio Iglesias and Willie Nelson's recording of "To All the Girls I've Loved Before" as one of the best — and oddest ever. How did this disparate duo ever get together in the first place? — F.A.

A: Albert Hammond, the composer/producer who conceived that hit, prides himself on his ability to "marry" diverse performers. When he paired the sexy Latin crooner with the charismatic country superstar for this chart-topping hit in 1984, it was the result of a five-year effort, a concerted push (no pun intended). "Julio and Willie had initially sung together in Austin, Texas, the year before," Hammond told me, "and it was singing love at first sight. ... Though from different worlds, the one ingredient they shared was that each sang from the heart."

Q: We were impressed with the passionate family conflicts de-

Scott Bryce resumes Craig Montgomery role on 'World'

A year ago, "As the World Turns" lost one of its major characters when Scott Bryce decided he'd had enough of playing Craig Montgomery and wanted to test the waters in other areas, such as prime-time. Douglas Marland, the chief writer on the soap, knew that the fans would be devastated by Craig's leaving, so he concocted a plotline in which Craig disappeared somewhere in the Greek Islands.

Now, a year later, Craig Montgomery is back and Scott Bryce is playing him once again.

Actually, Scott's return to the soap had been negotiated before he left. "Before I made the decision to leave," Scott said, "the producers worked out a deal which left it open for me to return to the show. We decided that a year would be the ideal time for me to do other things and see what the story was. I was very fortunate that this deal was made, because I knew that I was leaving a good role behind. It was hard for me to think that I would never put on Craig's shoes again."

Another major factor in Scott's decision to go to Hollywood was the concrete offer to play Jo's (Nancy McKeon) love interest in the popular prime-time sitcom "The Facts of Life."

"It was very interesting how that came about," Scott revealed. "Nancy McKeon evidently was a big fan of 'As the World Turns' and spent her lunch hour watching the show almost every day. When she found out that she was going to have a boyfriend whom she would marry in the show's final weeks, she told the producers that I was the one to play the part."

The "Facts" casting people got in touch with Scott and he was flown to Hollywood to test for the part, which he won, of course.

"Instinctively," he said, "I know not to go to Hollywood without a guarantee of work. There are too many actors who do that and end up lost in the shuffle. Casting agents in Hollywood don't know much about daytime.

When I was asked about my experience, I would mention my years on 'World' - which earned me two Emmy Award nominations - and they would ask for something else. Then I would tell them about my current 'Facts' role and that would spark some interest."

Scott said that the first day he came back to "As the World Turns," he had perhaps half an hour of the type of anxiety usually experienced by a newcomer. That feeling disappeared, of course, as soon as the cast and crew started shouting "welcome home!"

Scott is also excited about the plot possibilities involving Craig. Without divulging any big secrets, Scott said he will no longer be the nicest guy in the world. He hinted that Craig won't be neither all good nor all bad. The many traumas suffered by Craig will come home to roost in the next few weeks on the fine CBS soap.

When asked how long he is going to stay on the show, Scott merely smiled and said he didn't know. One thing he does know is that he would like to try his hand at filmmaking. His first ven-

ture in that area is a short film titled "TV Dad," which he produced and starred in with Annabelle Guritch. Scott also would like to find time to do more stage work. He last trod the boards with his dad, Ed Bryce (fans will remember him as Bill Bauer in "Guiding Light"), in a summer theater production of "Mass Appeal."

Scott Bryce's return to the role of Craig Montgomery in "As the World Turns" will please a great number of viewers who have been anxiously waiting for a year to find out whether Craig was dead or alive.



Kid-TV watchdog group turns 20

NEW YORK (AP) — Jay Leno, Garrison Keillor, Jane Pauley and Shelley Duvall joined congressmen, network executives, Mickey Mouse and Mr. Rogers on Monday to celebrate the 20th anniversary of Action for Children's Television.

The Massachusetts-based advocacy group was founded by Peggy Charren, a frequent visitor to Capitol Hill, where she testifies against commercialism and violence in children's programming.

"When we started in 1968, our goal was really to put ourselves out of business," said Charren. "We thought we'd make children's television so great, there would be no need for an advocacy group for children's television. I actually thought we'd do it in two years."

Rep. Edward Markey, D-Mass., one of the participants in Monday's program, suggested that if Massachusetts Gov. Michael Dukakis wins the

presidential election, Charren might have a much greater voice.

"Referring to Charren, he told the crowd, 'Michael Dukakis' chairman of the FCC (Federal Communications Commission) — so you better get to know her well. She's been ringing doorbells since 1962 for him.'

Markey expressed optimism for legislation that would restore limitations on commercial time in children's programming, a prime issue for ACT, which is especially opposed to a trend toward "30-minute commercials" for children's toys.

But the birthday party accentuated the positive, and the highlight was presentation of ACT Hall of Fame awards-to-stations, institutions and people who have, according to ACT, contributed most significantly to high-quality children's TV.

Leno, emcee of the celebration at Tavern on the Green, joked at one point that children who watch car-

toons probably believe "if you hit a dog with an axe, you get two dogs. If you hit it again, you get hot dogs."

Then Rep. Al Swift, D-Wash., presented awards to KRON-TV of San Francisco, KING 5 Television in Seattle and WMAQ-TV of Chicago for excellence in locally produced children's shows.

Keillor presented the award to The Disney Channel. The cable channel Nickelodeon received an award presented by Duvall. Marlene Sanders gave the award to PBS.

Lee Salk presented the award to Fred Rogers and his company, Family Communications. "We try to help children and their families feel as good as possible about who they are and what they can become, so they can look at their neighbor and feel the same way," said Rogers, who then asked the crowd to observe a minute of silence to think about those who have been important in their lives.

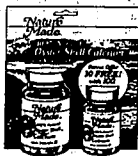

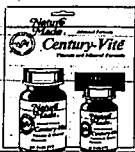
