Sun Valley Co. target

Group seeks to win control of ski facilities

KETCHUM — RSVP, the Committee to Restore Sun Valley's Ski Prominence, is considering several avenues to wrest control of the ski facilities on Bald Mountain from the Sun Valley Co.

In a private letter soliciting membership and large financial contributions from "a select group of influential citizens," the fledgling committee's chairman, Jim Gibson of Ketchum, leveled charges of anti-trust violations, restraint of trade and profiteering at the Sun Valley Co.

The letter, dated May 17, also outlined a plan to take over control of Bald Mountain.

Wally Huffman, general manager of the Sun Valley Co., was out of the office Thursday and could not be reached for comment.

Contents of the RSVP letter were leaked to Idaho Mountain Express reporter Marshall Ralph and were detailed in a June 1 story in the weekly paper.

The letter was not intended for the

public, said Bill Eitrem, a Ketchum real estate developer and RSVP member. However, he said he could not deny what was in the Mountain Express article.

The letter said "the continuation of the Sun Valley Company as the sole operator of the skiing facilities on our public lands is not in the community's best interests."

A three part plan was laid out for changing that arrangement.

1) Establish, in cooperation with the Forest Service and Sun Valley Co., a community-owned corporation which will buy a half interest — estimated at \$12 million — in the ski operation.

2) If step 1 fails, file a formal petition with the U.S. Forest Service requesting cancellation of Sun Valley Company's special use permit to run its ski operation on public land.

3) If step 2 fails, file suit against Sun Valley Co. alleging violation of state and federal anti-trust laws.

Eitrem said those steps are only suggested alternatives. RSVP has not decided whether it will pursue legal

U.S., Soviets enter time of openness

MOSCOW — Image may have overwhelped substance here this week, but American officials believe the Moscow summit will be remembered for building a foundation of openness and trust for future U.S.-Soviet relations.

"Military issues are the most important, but here, progress was thin," said one American participant in five days of summit talks between President Reagan and Soviet Communist Party General Secretary Mikhail S. Gorbachev.

It was uncertain whether arms talks will result in agreement on a new treaty drastically reducing strategic nuclear weapons before Reagan leaves office in January. That is the two leaders' condition for holding a fifth and final summit meeting this year.

"But there has been a sea change in atmospheres," the U.S. official said privately. He noted that "we are talking with them across the board" from missile cutbacks to cultural exchanges.

"If we are going to build a future relationship, these will be the building blocks," he said.

Another U.S. diplomat with years of experience in Soviet affairs said the Americans are "feeling more confident about the relationship" after the summit. He, too, spoke only on condition he not be identified.

Kremlin spokesmen made their

own upbeat assessment of glasnost-era summitry.

"If someone had told me three years ago that we would have such relations with the United States, I would have said it was a fantasy," said George Arbatov, head of the U.S.A.-Canada Institute in Moscow.

Foreign Ministry spokesman Genady Gerasimov said on a British Broadcasting Corp. interview that "we do have progress, but we could have even more."

To television viewers, the summit may have seemed designed to produce scenes of Reagan and Gorbachev clasping hands and grinning at each other.

There were some TV images unfavorable to the Soviets — KGB agents roughing up the White House press corps a few hours after Reagan arrived; police sealing off the apartment of a Jewish activist whom Reagan intended to visit.

There are fewer favorable Soviet images — an aging Reagan alongside a bright-eyed Gorbachev more than 20 years his junior; Gorbachev urging a faster pace in arms control negotiations while Reagan counsels caution.

Behind the images, U.S. and Soviet aides were busy bargaining over a far wider range of issues than their predecessors during the days of East-West detente in the 1970s.

America losing lead in living standard

WASHINGTON — The standard of living of workers in other major countries has risen four times as fast as the U.S. standard of living in the past 15 years, according to a new study on American competitiveness released Thursday.

The report, prepared by the Council on Competitiveness, concluded that the United States had lost ground not only in terms of living standards, but also in the related areas of international trade, productivity and investment.

"In an increasingly global economy,

others are often fast gaining on us or have surpassed America in the areas that will determine future competitive success," said Michael Porter, a Harvard University economics professor who served as a consultant on the study. "If we continue along the path we've been on since 1972, we could lose the competitiveness battle altogether."

The council is a coalition of executives from industry, organized labor and higher education who got together in 1986 to help American companies compete more effectively in world markets.

The new report is certain to

heighten the debate in the presidential campaign over whether the United States is becoming a second-rate economic power. Critics of Reagan administration policies point to the country's status as the world's largest debtor nation to highlight their contention that a string of record trade deficits during the 1980s shows that America has lost the ability to compete internationally.

The Reagan administration has dismissed such concerns, contending that the country's trade deficits have begun to improve and the United States is currently enjoying the longest peacetime expansion on record.

But the council's report argued that the administration's position neglects long-term economic trends that paint a more distressing picture.

"We would hope that both presidential candidates will have strong programs to propose in this area," Porter said. "This will give the American people a benchmark with which to grade the quality of each candidate's proposals."

The council presented what it called a "competitiveness" index, which it said measured America's performance against its competitors in global markets.

Couplets term wins 8th grader spelling title

WASHINGTON — Rageshree Ramachandran, a 13-year-old eighth grader from Fair Oaks, Calif., won the 61st National Spelling Bee on Thursday, scoring her victory with the word elegiacal, a form of couplets in a poem.

Rageshree, the Indian-born daughter of statistics professors at the University of California at Sacramento, defeated Victor C. Wang, 14, of Camarillo, Calif., after a prolonged head-to-head match. She had placed 36th in the 1986 bee.

Victor stumbled on the word stertorous, an adjective meaning characterized by a harsh snoring or rasping sound. Rageshree spelled the word correctly, then sealed her victory by correctly spelling elegiacal.

The winner won \$1,500 and other prizes from the sponsoring Scripps Howard newspapers, the runner-up \$1,000.

"I'm really happy," said Rageshree, known to her friends as Raga. "I have been studying hard since January, at least a couple of hours a day." Asked if she had any coaches, she laughed and

replied, "My mom and my dad. Also, my little sister. She's just 6, but she likes to ask words, too."

Rageshree, who was sponsored by the Sacramento Bee, said she was not surprised that Victor had misspelled six in the final round and she five. "There are always words that anyone can miss," she said.

For Victor, it also was his second appearance at the national bee. He placed 34th in the 1985 contest. He was sponsored by the Ventura County Star-Free Press.

Officials call Jerome student's death at school accidental

TWIN FALLS — A 15-year-old Jerome High School sophomore died early Thursday when a shotgun shell exploded in a pipe and he was struck in the stomach on the last day of class.

The death, called accidental by school authorities, happened shortly before school started. Mike Turner, a sophomore, died in a room next to the high school's band and chorus rooms.

High School Principal Jerry Diehl said Turner had fashioned a crude shotgun by tap-

ing a ball-bearing over the end of a chrome pipe from a band or microphone stand.

A witness confirms the death was accidental. "If he was gonna commit suicide, he would have given some hints," Turner's friend, Louis Reale said. "He came to school with a smile on his face."

Turner dropped a shotgun shell down the pipe and hit the pipe against a wall, Diehl said.

The concussion with the wall forced the ball bearing into the shotgun shell, which acted like a firing pin and set the shell off, Diehl said.

Jerome County Coroner Gerald Ostler said

an autopsy performed Thursday afternoon confirmed that Turner died of a severed aorta after being struck in the upper abdomen. He ruled the death accidental.

Two friends, Reale and Eric Walgamonti, were in the room with Turner when the accident happened, Diehl said. After the accident, the two went to the main band room.

"They were sitting on that table, crying their hearts out," Diehl said as he motioned toward a table in the main band room.

"I just don't think they had any idea it would happen," Diehl said. "He was just showing them how to detonate it."

Jerome County Deputy Sheriff Larry Webb

said the incident is still under investigation. "We haven't determined anything for sure," he said.

But Diehl and Superintendent Richard Kugler said they were sure the death was accidental. "I feel really bad this happened to this young man," Diehl said. "It was truly an accident."

Turner was the son of Shawna Miller. "The kid was very mild mannered," Diehl said. "He wore fatigues a lot. Turner was a 'pretty good' saxophone player, his friend Reale said. "He was a nice guy," Reale said.

"Kind of a joker, just like any normal teenager."

Reale said he had known Turner since the

5th grade, and about the only outside activity Turner had was collecting Angus magazines. The magazine specializes in mystery stories.

Diehl called a faculty meeting before school to tell faculty members the shooting was an accident. Students had the option to go home and not take final exams if they wanted, Diehl said.

Two suicides several years ago prompted the school to form a peer-counseling group, whose members train once a year for three days. The group's members try to talk to students who feel suicidal or depressed. "Some of those kids are taking it pretty hard," Diehl said. "They felt betrayed."

Burning plan draws complaints

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — A plan to burn buildings at the former Polatch sawmill site has drawn fire from environmental officials and neighbors concerned about air pollution.

Nearly a dozen fire agencies plan to burn the buildings to practice communications and coordination procedures during a major blaze. The fire also will clear the site so Hagadone Hospitality can build a resort, tennis and golf complex there.

But one environmental official said Wednesday she doubts firefighters will get much benefit from the drill.

"Standing outside a building and squirting water at it, you could do that with anything," said Armina Nolar of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency regional office in Seattle. "It isn't training to just watch a building burn down."

The fires, which are scheduled for the next two weekends, will add realism to a drill intended primarily to practice communications between independent emergency agencies, said Chief Don Donart of the Kootenai County Fire District.

Condenser to be in service soon

POCATELLO (AP) — Repair of Idaho Power's large synchronous condenser west of Pocatello is on schedule and it should be returned to service by June 18, reports Mike Mori, substations manager.

Mann said final repair costs won't be known for several weeks, but he expects them to be in the neighborhood of \$500,000. Insurance will pay for everything over \$250,000.

The 252-ton machine — Idaho Power's second largest piece of equipment next to the Brownlee No. 5 generating unit in the Hells Canyon complex — was damaged in an explosion at the Kinport substation last March.

It controls voltage from 345,000-volt transmission lines which feed into the substation from the Jim Bridger coal-fired power generating plant near Rock Springs, Wyo.

The utility had hoped in March to have it back on line in May. Hydrogen leaking from a broken bushing apparently was ignited by a spark from nearby auxiliary equipment.

Man charged with leaving scene

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — A Rigby man has been bound over to 7th District Court on charges accusing him of leaving the scene of a May 22 accident in which a girl died.

Francisco Trejo, 20, waived his right to a preliminary hearing Tuesday when he appeared in Bonneville County Magistrate Court, before Judge William Black.

The judge set arraignment for Monday and granted a defense request to reduce Trejo's bond from \$5,000 to \$1,000.

Trejo is charged with leaving the scene of a two-car collision in which Andrea Wheeler died. She was a passenger in a car driven by her mother, Christine Wheeler, who was hospitalized in Idaho Falls for two weeks.

Idaho Falls police reported the other car was registered to Trejo, but the driver fled the scene on foot following the collision.

Symms gives support for statue

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Sen. Steve Symms says he supports erecting a statue next to the Vietnam Memorial in Washington, D.C., to commemorate the 50,000 women who served the United States during the Vietnam War.

Symms met Wednesday in Idaho Falls with members of Idaho Freedom Bird, which thanked him for his support of an Idaho memorial to Vietnam veterans and recognition of women who served.

Symms has supported the construction of the Idaho State Vietnam Veterans Memorial at Idaho Falls' Freeman Park, and a statue in the nation's capital to commemorate the women who served in Vietnam.

"I feel very strongly that a memorial should be built and dedicated," he said.

Eight nurses died in the war, she said.

John Shaver, an official of Freedom Bird, a Vietnam veterans organization, said the service of women provided during the conflict should be recognized.

"Their service was just as honorable, just as important, although it was not as glory-oriented as that of the soldiers," he said.

Group plans to fight bigotry

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — A 14-member committee is seeking comment from eastern Idahoans about racial and religious intolerance so a plan can be formulated to fight bigotry.

Members will plan how eastern Idaho should respond to problems identified in a statewide survey regarding racial and religious intolerance, said Michael Orme, an Idaho Falls attorney and committee member.

The study was conducted for the Idaho Human Rights Commission and the Northwest Coalition Against Malignant Harassment by Boise State University.

Opposition predicted for wilderness bill

GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK, Wyo. (AP) — A congressman who chairs a committee that will review Idaho's wilderness bill predicts the proposal will meet opposition because of controversial language urged by Sen. James McClure.

Rep. Bruce Vento, D-Minn., said that state lawmakers should recognize that the water rights provisions and special management language will face stiff opposition and make it difficult to pass the long-debated wildland legislation.

"It's a tough issue anyway, dealing with wilderness, but when you begin to attach all sorts of other issues that affect wilderness in other states, it makes it almost impossible," he said at a news conference at scenic Jackson Lake Lodge Wednesday.

Senate hearings are scheduled June 21 on the compromise Idaho Forest Management Act crafted by McClure, R-Idaho, and Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus.

Vento contended McClure's decision to include the special provisions language indicates he is attempting to change the fundamental intent of the 1964 Wilderness Act, and he expects opposition from lawmakers in states where wilderness legislation has already been adopted.

But the monthly economic outlook produced by his division showed that at the end of April sales tax revenues fueled by a building boom were nearly \$4 million higher than expected, corporate tax payments were \$3 above the 10-month target and miscellaneous receipts were \$6 million higher than projected. Division analysts indicated in the forecast that those increases were expected to be maintained or increased somewhat by the end of the budget year.

Labor to be subject to Idaho sales tax

POCATELLO (Idaho AP) — The Idaho Tax Commission says labor on repairs of recreational vehicles such as motorcycles and snowmobiles will be subject to Idaho's sales tax beginning July 1.

But the bill's sponsor says the commission is misinterpreting the bill.

Rep. Michael Simpson, R-Blackfoot, who sponsored the bill, said Wednesday he knew nothing about the tax on labor for repairs of recreational vehicles.

Commissioner Bob Fry, Boise, said.

Rep. Pete Black, D-Pocatello, said he was aware of the language before the measure passed. He said he and three other Democrats privately criticized the labor tax section, but before they could gain support, legislators were voting on the bill's final passage.

According to the Tax Commission, the bill, which passed 43-39 in the House and 32-6 in the Senate, will affect recreational vehicle dealers and consumers in three ways after June 30.

— Labor and parts charges for recreational vehicle repairs will be subject to the 5 percent sales tax. In the past, only parts charges were taxed.

However, Rae Proctor, tax policy specialist with the Tax Commission, verified that the bill includes taxes on parts and labor.

"Frankly, I don't think the legislators understood all of the bill's state tax revenue."

Voices caution against spending

The House appropriations chairman and Idaho's top school official have added their voices to rising chorus of caution about use of a looming multimillion-dollar state revenue surplus.

Rep. Andrew G. Andrus, D-Idaho, said the surplus being discussed by analysts inside and outside the Andrus administration is beyond the \$2.5 million that lawmakers knew five months ago would be available for the 1989 budget.

The actual total of any surplus will be known by mid-July after final sales, income and other tax collections are tabulated from June.

"It is a little premature to start talking in terms of a special session to spend money we don't even have yet," said Rep. Kathleen Gurnsey, R-Boise.

Andrus Budget Director Charles Moss underscored previous administration warnings that some of the revenue windfall may actually be accelerated corporate tax payments that were actually counted on for the 1989 budget.

State Schools Superintendent Jerry Evans said he feared the speculation could hurt efforts to pass property tax overrides needed to keep school districts operating. Seven districts have overrides totaling more than \$4 million on the ballot in coming weeks and decisions about supplemental school financing are still pending in 10 other districts.

Earlier this week, both House Speaker Tom Boyd, R-Genesee, and Republican state Treasurer Lydia Justice Edwards also urged caution in handling any surplus.

Mrs. Gurnsey maintained that at least \$52 million of any surplus is already essentially committed to help

with next year's budget. She said about \$2.5 million was intended to be carried over from this year to next. She also said next year's budget is about \$2.7 million larger than anticipated tax revenue.

Andrus administration economists have already said it was highly likely actual tax revenues for the year that ends June 30 will run several million dollars more than the projections used during last winter's state spending debate.

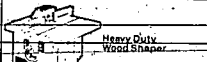

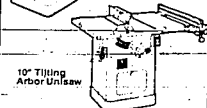

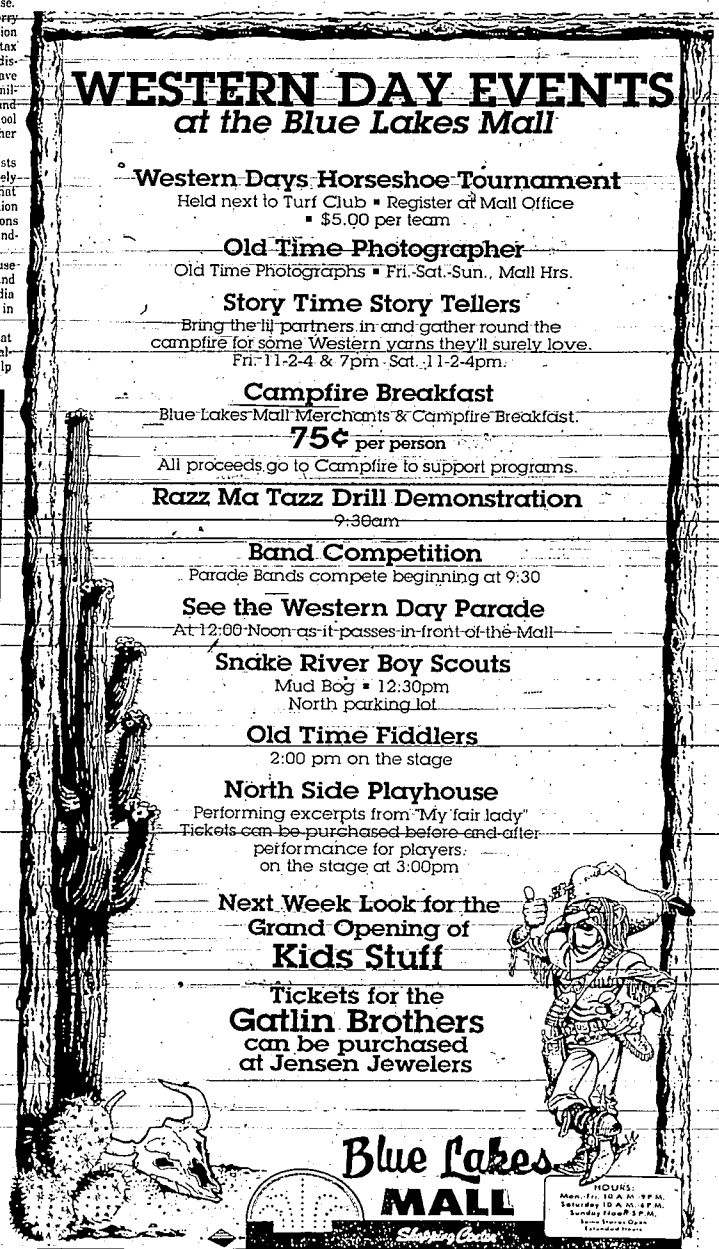

Tensions rising over water flowing to San Francisco Bay

California has a ninth of the nation's population and, in dollar terms, produces more than an eighth of the crops.
The people and agriculture both need vast amounts of water, but are concentrated in the drier parts of the state — from San Francisco south — where there are only three important sources of the precious product.
The first is an uneven supply of groundwater, already heavily mined.
The second is the Colorado River along the state's southeastern border — but California's share of this is also about to decline as Arizona and up-river states begin to take their full entitlements.
The third is the system of lesser rivers that arise in the state's eastern mountains and come together in San Francisco Bay.
Over the years the state and federal governments have greatly developed this third source, and it now is one of the most ambitious water storage and diversion projects in the world. Upstream are dams whose function is to spread the water over time, capturing excess flow in wet months for release in dry. In the flatlands are two aqueducts — government rivers — to move the water to unaccustomed places. Some is used to irrigate the

land. Farming and natural life are both adversely affected; the bay is not properly flushed; and as a political proposition, the interests of the wet northern part of the state are partly sacrificed to the dry, hundreds of miles away.
The critics would restore a more natural balance by recovering some of the water that now goes to agriculture; the larger farmers in the Central Valley particularly. They say the farmers could easily withstand the loss if only the water in the state now goes to agriculture and much of it is wastefully applied, in part because it is so cheap.
The environmentalists point out that part of agriculture's share of the subsidized water is used to produce crops that must then be further subsidized because they are in oversupply — the water is used to grow things for which there is an insufficient market. The redistributionists also note that agriculture compounds the environmental problem by contaminating the excessive amount of water it consumes.
The Central Valley is the most dramatic example of this, as well as of the broader proposition that man only solves one problem in na-

ture by creating another, equal and opposite.
The government engineers knew that they would face a drainage problem in some parts of the valley if they transported large amounts of water there. Their cheerful solution was to propose still more construction, of a massive drain to take the water back north to the Delta after it had been used. The Delta's defenders resisted, for fear the used water would be contaminated by agricultural chemicals and the salts in the valley soil, and the half-built drain was allowed to empty into the marshy Kesterson wildlife refuge instead. Then birds at Kesterson began to be born deformed: spotted wings, twisted beaks, single eyes, apparently because the effluent contained too much of the element selenium. Now the drain has been closed, and no one knows quite what to do. Other water from the aqueducts is filtered through the valley soil into the San Joaquin River, which carries it back north to the Delta — whence some is promptly pumped south again. The valley is stewing in its own salts.
The environmental groups can imagine three ways of prying more water away from the farmers. The first is by fiat: the state is now studying how much water to require be reserved for the Delta on environmental

grounds before the pumps can be turned on. A second is to raise the price (which is to say, lower the subsidy) of the government water, on the theory that a price increase will inspire healthy conservation just as it did with that equally basic commodity, oil, in the 1970s. A related third idea is to create a market in water so that urban and other users could buy it away from the farmers. The urban areas in Southern California are now trying to buy some water away from the farmers in the Imperial Valley; they are offering to line the irrigation ditches there in return for the water that would save. The farmers are holding out; they want the cities to pay for the water as well as the ditches.
But sooner or later they will strike a bargain. In California and the rest of the arid West, the politics and economics of water both are changing. The government's old easy-water policies may have made good sense when the state was empty, and the object was to grow. A tighter regimen is coming now that the reverse is true.

Meese's problems will shelve conservative legal agenda

Legal doctrines endure in the United States only if they are beloved by the majority of lawyers, legislators and the electorate to reflect fairness, common sense and enlightened public policy.
The implementation of any legal agenda requires a sustained public attack on conventional legal wisdom through sound, articulate and morally fetching advocacy. If the majority of lawyers and the people come to believe in the desirability of legal change, their viewpoints will ultimately prevail in courts through interpretations of the Constitution and statutes.
This phenomenon was evident when President Franklin D. Roosevelt and his attorney general, Robert Jackson, pushed the Supreme Court to discard a host of anti-Ne Deal decisions in 1937 by convincing the public that the rulings were intellectually flawed and disharmonious with American political traditions. The high court altered its constitutional vision before Roosevelt had appointed any new justices.
Public advocacy by the Department

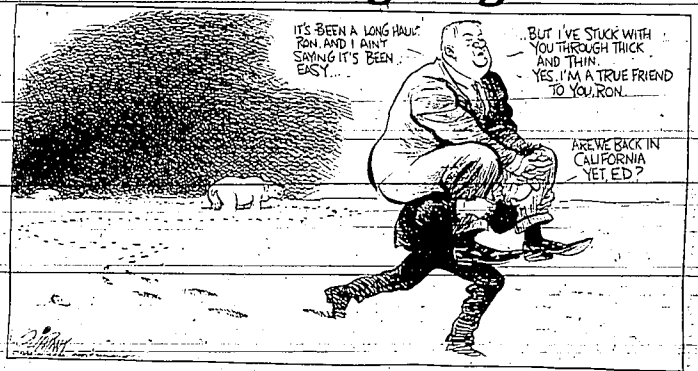
of Justice is pivotal to gaining acceptance by courts and lawyers of conservative legal doctrines championed by President Reagan and Attorney General Edwin Meese III. The tools of advocacy include speeches, legal briefs, law-review articles, legislative testimony and media appearances and interviews. To be successful, the advocacy must be intellectually rigorous, skillfully marketed and riveting to the media and its audiences.
Terry Eastland was the Department of Justice's tribune in sparking debate that tried to displace a phalanx of time-worn liberal dogmas with more conservative legal principles. In the areas of affirmative action, abortion rights, church-state relations, presidential prerogatives and criminal justice, Eastland was instrumental in obtaining a reasonable public airing of the conservative perspective. The efforts of Eastland, working through Meese, moved the intellectual debate to the center and center-

right of the political spectrum.
Because of such efforts by spokesmen like Eastland, there is growing public sympathy for a broad range of conservative legal objectives: the death penalty, parental participation in the abortion decisions of minors, a more balanced school presentation of religion in American history, discarding inflexible court-ordered rules that hamstring sheriffs, police interrogations of search-and-seizure practices, curbs on absentee or child-parent rivalry, eschewing racial or sexual preferences in the workplace when proof of illegal discrimination is absent, and halting sweeping court-bus-ing or prison edicts.
Eastland also engineered speeches and remarks of the attorney general urging that the intent of the constitutional framers should be the touchstone of constitutional interpretation. That interpretive doctrine is imperative to restrain activist justices from fastening their idiosyncratic views of wise policy on the nation under the banner of judging cases. The attorney general's remarks regarding original intent stimulated debate among Supreme Court justices and federal circuit judges. For the first time in decades, judges were displaying skepticism of liberal liberal Supreme Court precedents bequeathed in the heady days of the 1960s.
In April the Supreme Court, on its own initiative, voted 5-4 in *Patterson vs. McLean Credit Union* to consider overruling a 12-year precedent addressing racial discrimination in contracting. That signaled the court's re-

ceptivity to the re-examining of other precedents and legal principles that conservative legal scholars believe are faulty. The time thus is ripe for an aggressive litigating strategy by the Department of Justice before President Reagan leaves office.
Unfortunately, the problems surrounding Meese ensure that this won't happen. Incidents like Meese's recent and unceremonious ouster of Eastland confound any effort to expel the courts, the media, the law schools against liberal rulings bereft of constitutional moorings and injurious to sound public policy. It speaks volumes that Eastland, unlike

others who have left the Department of Justice, never deviated a millimeter from the intellectual foundations of the conservative legal agenda. The conclusion thus seems irresistible that Meese permitted his personal legal problems to trump the long-time benefits of conservative legal principles in ousting Eastland.
That ouster ensures that convincing and effective presentation of the conservative philosophy will be impossible during the remainder of Meese's term. Political calls for Meese's resignation and the forthcoming independent counsel report on allegations of ethical or legal wrongdo-

ing will dominate the discussions of the Department of Justice in the media, among lawyers and within the electorate.
This fallout from Meese's problems will make it almost inevitable that the conservative legal agenda will receive no boost from the Department of Justice for many years. That is a tragedy for the law, a tragedy for legal-political goals of Ed Meese and Ronald Reagan.

Analogophobia is a neurosis thus far unsustained by fact

Fear of computers — call it analogophobia — is a civil libertarian neurosis so far as it is concerned.
Only a decade ago, Americans were afraid of losing identity and privacy to machines that would make them numbers instead of names, reducing their persons to something as impersonal as a series of digits on a Social Security card or lumping all their heretofore separate credit cards into one big serial number.
Then we learned that machines, like people, make mistakes. Instead of prying into every cranny of a citizen's life, baring secrets withheld from loan officers or revealing political idiosyncrasies, the computers' outrages turned out to be bills sent to the wrong parties or failures to credit consumers with bills already

paid.
Far from being omniscient, computers were error-prone — because the people who operate them were — and are — error-prone.
Computers can't keep track of a human being with a real name, much less a number. The Jack Smiths and Jack Joneses of this world are no less confused with each other today than they were when mere people tried to recognize the dignity of the individual. The Arthur D. Seidenbaums of this world, people whose cumbersome identities must be spelled aloud for every reservation or receptionist, are

more confused than they used to be.
On my office wall are computer-generated letters ostensibly aimed at me, in their vagaries of address they hinged as a rich mesh of imprecise word-processing.
To the Easton Press of Norwalk, Conn., offering leather-bound books to "a privileged group of individuals," I am Art S. Edit. To Inc. Magazine, aimed at American entrepreneurs, I am Art S. Um. To the Jose Drudis-Biada Art Gallery of Mount St. Mary's College, my name is Eddie. But the Los Angeles Museum of Art, by contrast, knows me as Art S. Opinion. And so does Amnesty International. Among the thousands of mailing lists for sale in this great nation, one of them is busy merchandising me as

Opinion, perhaps a misspelling of the Los Angeles Times' Opinion department, where this wall full of missives is daily witness to the compounding of computer error.
The Constitutional Rights Foundation, bastion of civil liberty, addresses me as Art Secidann. The Foundation for America's Future calls me Art Seidenbaum. (Imagine the difficulty of generating an extra letter for an already run-on name.)
The most improbable and unpronounceable identity I have been forced to assume, however, is at home. US Sprint, the long-distance telephone service, addresses me as Art Seidenbaum every month, with a bill. For two years I have paid those bills, using checks with my real name, hand-lettering a correction

of the computer error and asking to be dubbed properly. I have never received an answer, a correction or anything but a new bill for Seidenbaum's telephone calls.
I wonder whether my widow, heirs or assigns will have to assume such a burden after I'm gone. Meanwhile, no one need worry about computers, so long as they are servants of human programmers, the machines will behave much like people — keeping some secrets, remembering a few faces but forgetting most names and generally refusing to admit mistakes.

Wright may face investigation

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House ethics committee began deliberations Thursday on whether to investigate allegations that Speaker Jim Wright violated the chamber's ethics rules.

Rep. Julian Dixon, D-Calif., said following a 2½-hour closed-door session that the panel did not reach a decision and would continue its discussions next week.

Wright, D-Texas, was accused of unethical behavior in a complaint filed last week by Rep. Newt Gingrich, R-Ga.

Perot helping Postal Service

WASHINGTON (AP) — Billionaire-computer pioneer H. Ross Perot launched a new business Thursday with the U.S. Postal Service as his first client — a contract to help find ways to cut costs and improve service.

The \$500,000 deal calls for Perot's new company, Perot Systems Corp., to study five specific areas of postal performance and recommend methods of saving money with better efficiency.

Postmaster General Anthony Frank said Perot and a team of computer systems experts will seek ways to cut costs in transportation, telecommunications, delivery services, revenue protection and transportation equipment.

Frank said he wants to find 10 to 20 areas of operations where the agency can save \$100 million or more, each, annually.

Valuable coin dies are missing

WASHINGTON (AP) — Dies used to strike the most valuable coin minted by the government are missing, a Treasury Department official acknowledged Thursday.

The Secret Service is investigating the disappearance in January of 24 dies for the obverse, or front, of 1-ounce gold bullion Eagles, said Michael Brown, a spokesman for the U.S. Mint. They were lost or stolen while en route between mints in San Francisco and West Point, N.Y., he said.

The Eagle has a face value of \$50 but the sales price, currently \$460 to \$470, fluctuates with the price of spot gold. The dies, which are 5-inch-long cylinders the width of a coin, are worth about \$40 each, Brown said.

Military bill wins approval

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Appropriations Committee voted approval Thursday of a \$300 billion military spending bill that gives President Reagan far less than he wanted for his "Star Wars" anti-missile defense.

The voice vote action sends the bill to the floor of the Democratic-controlled House, where it is expected to be considered next week.

The bill appropriates \$299.5 billion for the Pentagon for the fiscal year starting Oct. 1, which would be a reduction from the current defense budget of \$301 billion.

The bill appropriates \$3.5 billion for the Strategic Defense Initiative, as Star Wars is formally known. Reagan had sought \$4.9 billion for the program, which has a \$3.9 billion budget for the current year.

The appropriations bill did not contain a series of arms control restrictions added last month by Democrats to the authorization bill.

Those restrictions eliminated all but the smallest nuclear tests, require adherence to the unratified 1979 SALT II nuclear arms treaty and ban spending money for any Star Wars tests that violate the existing interpretation of the 1972 Anti-Ballistic Missile treaty.

The restrictions were dropped from the legislation approved Thursday chiefly because of a jurisdictional fight within the House between the Appropriations Committee and the Armed Services Committee, which oversees the authorization bill.

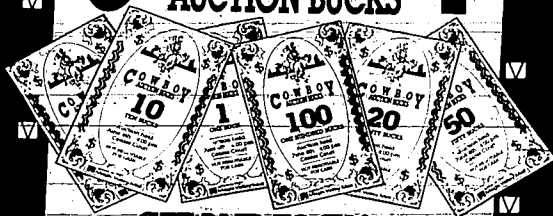

Airline unions play drug testing plans

WASHINGTON (AP) - A proposed mandatory drug-testing program for airline workers prompted sharp criticism Thursday from airline labor unions, which argued there is no evidence of a problem in the industry warrant it.

The union officials were among witnesses who testified at a public hearing on a proposed Federal Aviation Administration regulation that would require a broad range of drug tests, including random screening of tens of thousands of pilots, flight attendants and other airline employees.

Representatives of airline management backed the regulations, as did administration officials.

The drug-testing program "is crucial in our effort to establish a drug-free aviation system," said Transportation Secretary Jim Burnley, who conducted the hearing with FAA Administrator Allan McAtee.

The proposed regulations call for pre-employment tests, post-accident tests, tests if drug use is suspected, and a system of random tests of employees.

Burnley and McAtee have repeatedly called for a drug-testing program in aviation and last year began random testing of employees in a variety of safety-related jobs, including air-traffic controllers.

"We are concerned ... that the (department) may have already decided on the main elements of this proposal," especially random testing, said Raymond Woolfolk, representing the 40,000-member Air Line Pilots Association.

"He said the union is 'anticipating' opposition to random drug testing," he said. "There is no evidence has been shown that such tests are needed, or that they will be able to identify the small number - if any - of drug users in the industry."

He notes that one pilot, many thousands of tests would have to be given," Woolfolk said.

Eastern, Continental safe to fly, federal report says

WASHINGTON (AP) - Both Eastern Airlines and its sister carrier, Continental Airlines, are safe to fly, but a bitter labor-management war at Eastern raises possible safety risks if allowed to continue, a government report concluded Thursday.

After an unprecedented two-pronged investigation of Texas Air Corp. and its two main airline subsidiaries, the Transportation Department declared that both Eastern and Continental are fit to operate and are generally providing safe transportation.

But the report raises strong concerns about the long-standing labor disputes at Eastern, saying that "in a company so divided" the turmoil between labor and management presents the risk of having "an adverse impact on the public safety."

As a result, the Federal Aviation Administration announced that it was continuing its special surveillance of Eastern beyond the recent

ly concluded plane-by-plane inspection of the airline.

Transportation Secretary Jim Burnley also announced he had listed former Labor Secretary William Brock as a special emissary to try to defuse the labor conflicts at the Miami-based air carrier and "to identify the tensions within the company."

Texas Air chairman Frank Lorenzen welcomed Brock's participation.

House OKs expansion of Medicare

WASHINGTON (AP) - The House gave its final approval Thursday to a catastrophic health insurance bill that makes the first major expansion of Medicare since the health program for the elderly was established in 1965.

The 328-72 vote to adopt a compromise bill reached May 25 by a House-Senate conference committee sends the legislation to the Senate for final congressional action, probably next week.

Senate concurrence is assured and Health and Human Services Secretary Otis R. Bowen has said he will ask President Reagan to sign the measure.

House Speaker Jim Wright, D-Texas, called the bill "the most important health initiative in recent years."

It is intended to protect America's 32 million Medicare recipients against financially devastating hospital and doctor bill charges by capping the out-of-pocket charges they would have to pay in any one year.

The bill provides full hospital coverage after a once-a-year deductible estimated at \$564 in 1989 and indexed to hospital inflation. Medicare now pays full charges for no more than 59 days a year and the recipient is subject to a deductible for each hospitalization.

The cap on costs for physicians is \$1,370 a year. After a \$75 deductible, Medicare now pays 80 percent of approved doctor bills and that part of the program remains intact. Starting in 1989, however, the \$75 deductible and the 20 percent share paid by beneficiaries counts toward the \$1,370 cap. After that is reached, Medicare pays 100 percent of approved doctor bills.

However, the beneficiary will remain liable for any portion of doctor bills that exceed the fees approved by Medicare.

In a new benefit, Medicare will pay half of outpatient prescription drug costs in 1991 after a \$600 deductible is met. The government share rises to 60 percent in 1992 and 80 percent in 1993. However, the deductible is expected to rise each year to keep pace with rising drug costs.

Medicare now does not cover outpatient drugs except for a handful of very expensive ones such as anti-rejection medication for organ transplant recipients.

All this additional benefits are to be paid for by additional charges to Medicare enrollees - a combination of flat monthly premium increases deducted from Social Security checks and an additional, sliding-scale supplemental premium that will be charged to the estimated 40 percent of the elderly with enough income to make them subject to federal income taxes.

The additional flat premium starts at \$4 a month in 1989, climbing to \$10.20 in 1993. The so-called supplemental premium - in essence an income tax surcharge - starts at \$22.50 a year for each \$150 of income tax owed in 1989, climbing to an additional \$42 a year on each \$150 of tax liability by 1993.

All 57 in coal mine feared blast victims

BORKEN, West Germany (AP) — Some of the 57 men in the Stolzenbach coal mine survived a devastating gas explosion but suffocated when their emergency masks ran out of oxygen, officials said Thursday. All are presumed dead.

Among them was an 18-year-old who was working his first shift as a miner when the explosion occurred Wednesday afternoon.

He had "graduated from school last Friday and wanted to earn some money before continuing his education," Mayor Bernd Hessler, told reporters. Hessler would not give the young man's name, honoring the family's wishes.

Rescue workers brought the first 12 bodies to the surface Thursday afternoon and took them to a temporary mortuary in metal caskets. Gottfried Mille, Hesse state interior minister, said 36 bodies had been found and the others were scattered over a wide area underground.

At least 14 of the dead miners were Turkish-immigrants. Families and friends — Germans and Turks together — clung to each other at the mine 70 miles northeast of Frankfurt, eyes red and swollen from tears and lack of sleep.

Around them, men with grim faces black with coal dust and soot moved to and from the mine intent on retrieving all the bodies.

"My son Peter is down there. He's been a miner for 20 years," said Werner Henke, who waited at his son's house. "God, let him be alive. He has two small children."

Wulf Boettcher, a state mining official, said: "The chances of finding any survivors have sunk to zero."

Rescue workers broke through tons of debris and battled rising water in the effort to retrieve the bodies of all 57 victims of West Germany's worst mining accident since 1962.

"Some of the dead were found with their miners' breathing masks on," said Erwin Braun, head of the Hesse state mining board. "That means they survived the blast and apparently ran out of air."

He said the emergency masks had about three hours of oxygen, but Boettcher put the time at about 45 minutes.

Braun said the explosion was caused by a buildup of methane gas.

Stefan Walscher, the local prosecutor investigating the disaster, told reporters it could be several days before all the bodies are located and brought out.

Policies won't change, Gorbachev stresses

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev stressed Thursday there will be no changes in his country's human rights policies despite President Reagan's emphasis on this issue during the Moscow summit.

Hours after Reagan left Moscow at the end of the five-day summit, Gorbachev told several hundred peace activists the Soviet Union "will not accept any advice on how we run our affairs."

"We do not need anyone else's values. We do not need anyone else's rules," he said.

Reagan highlighted human rights by meeting with dissidents and Jewish refuseniks during his visit to Moscow, and by stressing the issues of freedom of expression and economic creativity in speeches and his talks with Gorbachev.

But Reagan also ran into trouble with some refuseniks for remarks he made later in the visit seeking to involve Gorbachev of responsibility for Jewish emigration restrictions.

Gorbachev, the Soviet Communist Party leader, told a news conference Wednesday he was "not filled with admiration" for Reagan's meeting with the dissidents

and refuseniks. "We are far from imagining our country perfect in all respects," Gorbachev said. He said that problems which Reagan mentioned "do take place, but this is not the situation. This is not an overall picture of Soviet society."

"I told the president that we have our own view of the human rights situation in his own country," Gorbachev said. He said the two countries told a working group formed to tackle the problem that "we're open and ready for any discussion on this matter."

About 4,500 Jews have been allowed to emigrate so far this year and more than 8,000 left in 1987. Those figures are much higher than they were in previous years but far below the peak year of Jewish emigration of more than 51,000 in 1979.

The Soviet leader said that in his four summit meetings with Reagan, "the content of what we have achieved is immense," but that more progress could have been made.

He criticized once more Reagan's Star Wars program for a space-based shield against nuclear attack.

New leader is selected for Iran's armed forces

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini on Thursday appointed Parliament Speaker Hashemi Rafsanjani acting commander-in-chief of Iran's armed forces after major military defeats on land and sea.

The appointment increased the political power of the man Iranians call "the shark." Iran's official media, monitored in Nicosia, reported that Khomeini, who has held the title of commander-in-chief, gave Rafsanjani "full authority" to take over control of military affairs.

Rafsanjani's appointment followed a disastrous confrontation with the U.S. Navy in the Persian Gulf and two defeats on the battlefield in which the Iraqis drove the Iranians out of their two main footholds inside Iraq.

Khomeini's decision to hand over military power to one of his closest aides raised speculation that the revolu-

tionary patriarch's health is deteriorating. Khomeini is 87 and has long been reported to be in poor health.

Rafsanjani, nicknamed "the shark" because of his political acumen, is expected to seek to galvanize Iran's military, dispirited after its defeats, and the nation's 50 million people who appear to be growing weary of the war.

Rafsanjani declared Iran was "at war" with the United States last month after the U.S. Navy sank or disabled six Iranian vessels, including two frigates, in clashes in the Persian Gulf on April 18.

U.S. Defense Department analysts said in Washington that Iraq's victories meant it was now conceivable that Iraq, having gone onto the offensive after years of static defense, could break the stalemate in the ground war.

Swedish navy fires upon submarines

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) — The Swedish navy detonated depth charges and anti-submarine grenades off the southern Baltic Sea coast Thursday in the second hunt this week for underwater prowlers.

Per Brissman, a defense staff spokesman, said electronic monitors picked up signs of "foreign underwa-

ter activity" during a navy exercise outside Oxelesund, 60 miles south of Stockholm.

He said the sub hunters exploded several depth charges and Elima grenades, a Swedish weapon designed to pierce a 1-inch hole in a hull to cripple a vessel without destroying it.

On Monday, the Swedish military set off a mine outside the Musko naval base south of Stockholm after a warning system indicated a possible intruder.

Sweden has not identified the nationality of submarines the military says have repeatedly snopped in Swedish waters. The last submarine caught was a Soviet vessel that ran aground outside a naval base in 1981.

Man shoots at art, will stay in hospital

LONDON (AP) — A man who fired a shotgun at a drawing by Leonardo da Vinci at the National Gallery was ordered Thursday to remain indefinitely in a high-security mental hospital.

Robert Cambridge, 37, was sent to Broadmoor asylum last December after being convicted of blasting the priceless artwork on July 17, 1987, in a social protest.

Judge Richard Lowry of the Old Bailey Criminal Court said after reviewing a psychiatrist report that Cambridge should remain at Broadmoor because he was a danger to the public.

Cambridge blasted a six-inch gash in Leonardo's 450-year-old charcoal and chalk drawing of the Virgin Mary with the infant Jesus and two saints. It is undergoing restoration.

He said he attacked to demonstrate his disgust with "political, social and economic conditions in Britain," according to testimony at his trial.

Group fires administrator at St. Benedict's

JEROME — A hospital management group has fired the administrator of St. Benedict's Family Medical Center over a difference in management style, officials say.

"I wouldn't call it a firing," said John Kee, who replaces John Schaper as the temporary administrator. "We didn't see eye-to-eye on management style."

Kee said the termination was mutually agreed upon after a meeting between Schaper, who was hired in January, and officials from Holy Cross

Health Management Services, which is contracted to provide hospital administration.

"He wasn't terminated for some bizarre reason," Kee said. "It had nothing to do with his personality."

He said Schaper, like other personnel in the management group brings in to a new position, was in a testing stage in which the company wanted to see if he was the right person for the job. "It didn't pan out," Kee said.

Schaper declined to comment on the action. "It was their decision and I have to live with it," he said.

When asked what precipitated the

action, Schaper said, "I don't think it would be proper to say I have to use these people as references."

Kee, who is the director of finance for the management group, served as an interim administrator for six months after administrator Bob Campbell resigned after eight years in August 1987.

Schaper held administrative posts in Richmond, Wash., Las Vegas and Culicute, Nev. and in Illinois before coming to Jerome.

"He is a capable, honorable, fine person," Kee said. "We just came to a point that we need to go in different direc-

tions. Hospital Chairman Roger Burdick said the decision to fire Schaper was handled completely in house.

"I had not heard of any major problems within the community or at the hospital," Burdick said. "You've got to have faith in the people you hire that they are doing the right thing."

Kee said the company is considering two hospital employees for the position as well as other people in the area.

"There is one very strong candidate within our system," he said. "We would

like to get someone we know well and who knows how we like to operate the facility."

Kee said the company wants to avoid a lengthy search which might involve advertising in the Wall Street Journal and other national publications. He said that would be expensive.

"I'd like to get someone placed that would be a good long-term administrator," Kee said. Before an administrator is selected, the hospital board of trustees must interview the candidates and approve one.

Idaho now receiving pamphlets on AIDS

TWIN FALLS — Federal brochures on AIDS will begin appearing in mailboxes across Magic Valley within the next few days, as part of an unprecedented mailing across the United States.

Surgeon General C. Everett Koop and Otis Bowen, secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, have sent the material to educate the country about the fatal and incurable disease.

"The purpose of this brochure is to tell you how you can, and just as important, how you can't become infected with AIDS," the brochure states. "Your children need to know about AIDS. Discuss it with them as you would any health concern."

The brochures will blanket 107 million U.S. households by June 15. The material's content has already stirred controversy in Salt

Lake City, where nearly one million brochures arrived destined for Utah, Nevada, Oregon and Idaho.

Approximately 20 people in Idaho have been diagnosed as having AIDS.

While not mailed in a plain, brown wrapper, the literature titled "Understanding AIDS" is sealed. It describes in a straightforward manner how AIDS is transmitted through sex and blood.

The material is frank. "The AIDS virus can be spread by sexual intercourse whether you are male, female, heterosexual, bisexual or homosexual," it states. "The virus can enter the body through the vagina, penis, rectum or mouth."

Also within the eight-page pamphlet are descriptions of "risky behavior" for contracting AIDS from an infected person.

Topping the list are sharing drug needles, "anal sex, with or

Local schools receive recognition for excellence

O'Leary cited for 9 innovative programs

Excellence has its just rewards. That is a lesson well-learned by the teachers, administrators and students at O'Leary Junior High School.

The largest of Twin Falls' two junior highs has been recognized as one of the best in the state by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges.

The school's "exemplary" programs and near-perfect scores in 11 standards established by the Association earned it accreditation with merit status, according to Dr. David Steadman, the group's executive director.

The award "really is an outstanding honor for the school's administrators, Steadman said.

He is considering for the award, a school must have at least one outstanding program which stands above other schools in the area, Steadman said.

O'Leary has several such programs. A team sent by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges to examine O'Leary's qualifications for the award commended the school for nine innovative programs ranging from beautification of the campus to programs for dealing with student drug abuse.

Project Impact, a district-wide program dealing with substance abuse, was started by third-year principal Norman "Duke" Wiseman.

A "care team" of two counselors and two teachers meets with students returning from treatment for chemical dependency on a weekly basis. The students are then assigned two classmates of their own choosing as peer contacts.

"We're trying to set up a network of support for these kids," said Joyce Houston, the care team coordinator, who becomes O'Leary's assistant principal next fall.

Team members are also trained for intervention in which students with potential drug problems are referred to the team. The student's teachers are then asked about the student's academic progress, attendance and other factors to help determine if a problem exists. The child's parents are then contacted and advised of local agencies that are available to help.

Houston said she has been impressed with the program which served about a dozen students in its first year. She said that more students will likely take advantage of the Impact program as it becomes more widely established.

"This program really is helpful for these kids. You can see it in their attitude," Houston said.

A good attitude is essential

Wood River gets 2nd award

HAILEY — For the second time in the program's four-year history, Wood River High School has been honored with the Accreditation with Merit award for excellence by the Idaho Association of School Administrators.

The award, which will be presented next week in Sun Valley at the association's annual meeting, honors only nine high schools and six junior high schools in the state.

The recipients represent "the cream of the top 10 percent" of more than 160 secondary schools throughout the state, said Evelyn Curran, a consultant for accreditation and elementary school approvals for the State Department of Education.

The Accreditation with Merit designation is granted by the Northwest Committee on Schools and Colleges, based at the Boise State University campus.

For a school to be accredited with excellence, it first has to meet all standards imposed by the state. Then, after a self-submitted application process, the schools are chosen based upon any exemplary programs in a school's curriculum which differ from other schools in the state.

Schools only can apply every other year. This is the fourth year the Northwest accreditation program has been in effect.

Wood River High School, which serves students in Blaine County from north of Ketchum to the south Bellevue area, was chosen for several reasons, said Jeff Taylor, a member on the state accreditation review committee and principal of Burley Junior High School.

Taylor said one of the school's exemplary programs was the Industrial Technology courses offered in conjunction with Wood River Junior High School.

"Their program is, without a doubt, as good as any I've seen within the state," Taylor said, adding he doubted many junior colleges or small colleges have as much technical equipment at their disposal as Wood River.

Taylor said he was also impressed with the way the high school handled the fluctuation of "migrant" students. An impressive 100 students each year come and go with the ski season. This situation requires the school to adapt specialized curriculums to accommodate the needs of special groups, such as the Olympic Junior-Ski Team, Taylor said.

Wood River High School principal Phil Homer said he is very pleased the school has received this designation for the second time. "It tells the patrons and school board members that the staff and administration run a good program," he said.

Homer also cited the school's Distinguished

Aggravated assault charged in shooting

TWIN FALLS — Police Thursday arrested a Twin Falls man accused of shooting a Nevada man in the face during a heated argument in the morning's early hours.

Charles Gary Herrick, 41, was charged with aggravated assault and was in custody on a \$10,000 bond.

Police arrested Herrick at his home at 1171 Starfire St. where the shooting occurred around 3:30 a.m.

Lee Scott Parker, the shooting victim, was hospitalized in serious condition Thursday afternoon at the Magic Valley Regional Medical Center, Public Safety Chief Tim Qualls said.

Parker, a 39-year-old resident of Wendover, Nev., was shot below his left cheek and the bullet exited behind his left ear.

"I guess his teeth just disappeared," Qualls said.

Herrick, whose home sits in an attractive neighborhood on the

city's northwest side, allegedly shot Parker once with a .38 caliber handgun, according to court records. The two men met earlier in the night at a Twin Falls bar.

A neighbor called police and said he heard loud arguing at the house and then a single gunshot, according to police records.

"Parker was still fighting until we got him into the hospital," Qualls said.

Herrick has previously been arrested on charges of robbery and disturbing the peace, according to court records.

Prosecutors provided notice in court documents of their intention to seek an enhanced penalty on the felony charge since it was committed with a deadly weapon.

Twin Falls attorney Terry Johnson represented Herrick at his initial court appearance Thursday afternoon. Herrick, a short, stocky man with wavy brown hair, was handcuffed and in orange prison garb during the proceeding.

Drug offender faces corrections, not jail

TWIN FALLS — Fifth District Judge Daniel Mechl Tuesday sentenced a Twin Falls man 120 days to prove she's qualified for a probation sentence on two drug convictions.

Mechl sent Sherland K. Hoskins to a state correctional program at Cottonwood after a sentencing hearing Tuesday. After the 120-day period, Mechl will decide if Hoskins qualifies for probation.

If Mechl decides against probation, Hoskins will serve a five-year state penitentiary sentence on charges of aiding the delivery of marijuana and delivering psychoactive mushrooms.

The 31-year-old Hoskins was convicted by a jury in March. She was one of 17 people indicted by a grand jury in October.

Deputy Prosecutor Joel Horton

said Hoskins, who now lives at 362 Caswell Ave., was unfit for probation because she continued to deny her guilt. At her trial, Hoskins said she had no intention to sell drugs until a state attorney drug agent continually asked her to sell drugs.

"She denied her participation in the first sale and knowledge of the substance in the second deal," Horton said. "That denial makes her unsuitable for probation."

But Hoskins's attorney, Thomas Kershaw, said the prosecution was trying to punish Hoskins for exercising her right to a trial.

"This is sort of an outrageous situation," Kershaw said. "The message being sent is if you go to trial and make the state prove you're guilty, a defendant will get a harsher sentence, he said.

"That's the message they want to send to defendants," he said.

without a condom," and "vaginal or oral sex with someone who shoots drugs or engages in anal sex."

Safe behavior is not having sex, not shooting drugs and sex with one mutually faithful, uninfected partner, "although it also warns, 'you can't tell by looking if a person is infected.'"

The pamphlet also punctures

myths surrounding the deadly virus, saying "You won't get AIDS from insects - or a kiss."

A female with AIDS is also pictured to acknowledge that AIDS knows no boundaries of sex, race or class.

"AIDS is not a 'we,' they" disease, it's an "us" disease," said the woman, identified only as Carolyn.

The brochure advertises a national, toll-free hotline - 1-800-

342-AIDS - for people to call about taking protective measures against AIDS or for help in being tested for the disease.

It also carries a toll-free number to order Spanish-language versions of it.

And an unusual invitation on the pamphlet reads, "Reproduction of the contents of this brochure is encouraged."

Kershaw also argued that testimony by Stuart Robinson, the drug agent who investigated the case, shouldn't be given any weight.

Robinson said surveillance on Hoskins' prior residence indicated a large number of cars arriving and leaving quickly. In addition, an anonymous journal sent to the Twin Falls Department of

Public Safety chronicled the number of cars and their license plates that visited the house.

Horton said that kind of activity indicated Hoskins was engaged in the "systematic distribution" of controlled substances.

Kershaw said Horton was trying to convict Hoskins of crimes she may have committed but the police couldn't prove.

Meehl ruled that Hoskins was

dealing in drugs regularly before her indictment and arrest, but not recently. After weighing factors for and against imprisonment, he decided to delay his decision on imprisonment until Hoskins could spend three months at Cottonwood.

"You have the keys to the penitentiary in your hand," Meehl said.

Excessive force argument gains retrial

BOISE (AP) - The Court of Appeals has ordered a new trial for a Hayden man who claims the jury that convicted him of obstructing police and assaulting an officer may not properly instruct on his right to resist excessive police force.

"A person has a constitutional right not to be subjected to excessive force by law enforcement officers in the performance of their duties," Judge Donald Burnett wrote in the opinion issued Thursday.

Spurr denied initially lunging at the officer, maintaining the deputies started the altercation by using force at the outset.

Magistrate A.H. Parrish, who handled the misdemeanor case, rejected Spurr's instruction to the jury that a person could lawfully use reasonable force to protect himself if an officer uses excessive force in making an arrest.

Instead, the magistrate instructed the jury that a person who has grounds to believe he is being arrested by a police officer

cannot use force to resist arrest whether or not there is a legal basis for the arrest.

The appeals court said that instruction applied only to arrests "peacefully undertaken by police officers." But since there was a conflict in the evidence on whether the officers tried to make a peaceful arrest, the jury had to be instructed about Spurr's right to resist if excessive force was used.

The determination of whether excessive force has been used is a question of fact for the jury," the appeals court held. "The instruction given by the magistrate completely removed this question from the jury's consideration. ... It was critical that the jury be informed that if the officers had used excessive force, Spurr had a right reasonably to defend himself."

UI alumni could gain political power

MOSCOW (AP) - The thousands of University of Idaho alumni in Idaho will play a greater role in bridging the political distance from Moscow to Boise over the next year, says the new president of the UI Alumni Association.

"We've got 25,000 to 30,000 people living in the state, and if those people would become active in state politics, the education by getting out and talking to legislators, they would have a tremendous impact," said Vic Smith, 49, of Boise.

A 1964 UI graduate, Smith is vice president and manager of First Security Bank's private banking division.

Smith, who moved from Lewiston to Boise in December, said

he's heard the concerns of many alumni who perceive Boise State University as usurping the UI's role as being the state's only comprehensive institution of higher learning and research.

"There are some Idaho alumni who are concerned because of the political environment here in Boise," he said. "Maybe something could happen to inroad the position of the University of Idaho. My opinion as the leader of the alumni is it needs to be protected."

But Smith is not advocating open warfare between the two institutions. Instead, he wants to mobilize UI alumni to improve overall funding of education in Idaho.

"We need to strive in our

alumni association to develop a grassroots organization to become more politically powerful," said Smith. "The alumni from UI, BSU, Idaho State University and Lewis Clark State College must not only be talking to legislators but other groups saying, 'We have to fund education, it's an investment.'"

"The 'education investment' message is heard frequently, but Smith said alumni must take the plea a step further.

"Given that rhetoric, we have to say we're willing to have our taxes increased," he said. "We can't just ask them to perform miracles and then stand up and say we're not willing to pay for

IACI head supports economic planning

LEWISTON (AP) — Idaho lawmakers this year paid little attention to the Department of Commerce's economic agenda, the president of the Idaho Association of Commerce and Industry says.

"When legislators get to town they have the tendency to focus on what's in front of them. That's understandable," said Greg Casey, who spoke Wednesday to the Lewiston Chamber of Commerce.

But the Commerce Department's long-term goals need to be addressed to help economic recovery. The people of Idaho should demand that their lawmakers follow the plan rather than emphasize only short-term solutions, he said.

"You have a plan let's stick to it," he said. "If it doesn't work, change it, not ignore it."

The economic agenda seeks to make Idaho more attractive to business, in part by looking at ways to change tax laws for relocation or expansion. The agenda also

urges a more stable tax structure. But Casey said Idaho's only tax incentive, the investment tax credit, is being threatened. He suggested the media should ask Gov. Cecil Andrus how his campaign to repeal the ITC jibes with the commerce department's economic goals.

A mixed signal is being sent to businesses. Repeal of the ITC would make Idaho's tax structure "incredibly unpredictable," he said.

Casey also blasted efforts to get ITC repeal on the general election ballot. "The initiative process for every nut-and-bolt-in-the-tax-system is not the way to correct problems, he said."

The Lewiston Chamber opposes repeal of the investment credit. Casey said he wouldn't attempt to defend or justify the ITC to the chamber audience but he did say he wanted to set forth "the truth about numbers."

Adoption ads rise as ban approaches

LEWISTON (AP) — With a law banning the practice about to take effect, the number of advertisements seeking children for adoption is climbing in some Idaho cities.

Newspapers at Twin Falls and Pocatello, as well as the Lewiston Tribune, report either an increase in the advertisements or they have received level.

At Boise, the number of adoption advertisements has dropped.

"Concerns that advertised offers to pay a mother's medical expenses carried the potential for baby selling led the 1988 Legislature to call for an end to the practice. The law takes effect July 1.

"The numbers are quite small when you look at the big picture, but we were seeing an increase and the type of advertisement was becoming more blatant," said Kent Henderson, Boise, supervisor of the Department of Health and Welfare's family center services section.

"The potential for setting up a black market baby placement procedure or whatever you want to call them was there. We felt quite strongly the type of advertisement

and the implied possibility of payment was inappropriate."

But John Corsini of Cincinnati, Ohio, whose advertisement began appearing this week in the Lewiston Tribune, counters that lawmakers would do better to deal with abortion, which he contends has created the baby shortage.

"If the lawmakers couldn't have a family of their own, I think they might have a different idea about this," Corsini said. "As long as it's handled legally and properly, I don't think there should be a problem with advertising. What I'm doing is trying to help a gal out and fulfill our lifetime dream."

Corsini, 36, and his wife, Virginia, 33, have been married seven years. They've been attempting to adopt a child for two years. By relying upon conventional means, adoption could take another three or four years to complete, Corsini said.

"You have to take the initiative on your own, try to find your own baby and then try to have the lawyers handle it from there," he said.

After hearing of another couple's success through advertising, Corsini

said he decided to try it. Idaho was in the back of his mind, Corsini said, and he happened upon Lewiston by chance. He then determined that the area was served by a state college and nearby university.

"I just had a good feeling about it, that it was the type of town where abortions are not prevalent, (and an area) where adoption agencies are not the massive type of agencies you find in larger areas," he said.

So far, the advertisement has produced one response, but nothing came of it, he said.

Meanwhile, state officials have not passed the word about the new state law. They plan to alert Idaho media

some time this month and will have to rely upon individual advertising departments to enforce the law, particularly with out-of-state clients.

But it does appear that a last minute rush of advertisements is under way in some areas to beat the June 30 deadline. Four individuals have placed advertisements with the Tribune, and another four have inquired about placing ads since mid-April, says Tribune Classified Manager Diane Holzer.

At Pocatello, home of Idaho State University, at least 20 adoption advertisements have appeared in the Idaho State Journal during the past month.

Boisean dies after transplant
BOISE (AP) — After waiting months to receive a heart transplant expected to save his life, Ken Cooke, 60, Boise, died four hours after the operation.

On Sunday, a team of Salt Lake City doctors performed the transplant, but Cooke died of heart failure.

"It's a fluke thing that happened," said Dee Rose, a friend of the Cookes. "Cooke wanted to take him."

The surgery at the University of Utah Hospital was routine, said spokesman Ken Johnson.

After the surgery, Cooke's wife, Melva, 56, was told her husband would not live and was given a chance to see him before he died, Rose said.

Doctors did not know Wednesday why the donor heart failed. An autopsy was planned.

Rose set up a trust fund to help the Cookes pay bills. Illness had hurt the couple financially. About \$400 was donated.

The couple spent three months at a Salt Lake City apartment, waiting for a telephone call from the hospital.

Burning plan causes discord
COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — A plan to burn buildings at the former Potlatch sawmill site has drawn fire from environmental officials and neighbors concerned about air pollution.

Nearly a dozen fire agencies plan to burn the buildings to practice communication and coordination procedures during a major blaze. The fire also will clear the site so Hagadone Hospital can build a resort, tennis and golf complex there.

But one environmental official said Wednesday she doubts firefighters will get much benefit from the drill.

"Standing outside a building and squirting water at it, you could do that with anything," said Armina Nolan of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency regional office in Seattle. "It isn't training to just watch a building burn down."

The fires, which are scheduled for the next two weekends, will add realism to a drill intended primarily to practice communications between independent emergency agencies, said Chief Don Donart of the Kootenai County Fire District.

Boise gets acting police chief
BOISE (AP) — Boise Police Capt. Mike Prynch has been named acting chief, to replace departing Chief Jim Montgomery.

Montgomery is leaving June 10 to become sheriff of King County, Wash., in Seattle. Prynch, 37, will serve until a permanent chief is selected.

"I look at it as a wonderful opportunity and I would be crazy not to put my best foot forward," said Prynch, who joined the Boise department in 1973 and has made a quick rise through the ranks.

Prynch, who oversees the 98 officers in the Patrol Division, will continue as commander of that unit while he is acting chief.

"My main objective is to do the best possible job and provide some stability during these changes," he said.

Mayor Dirk Kempthorne said a nationwide search for a chief is planned, and he expects it to take about four months.

Ruling affects Wyoming jurors
CHEYENNE, Wyo. (AP) — A Utah federal judge's ruling may force Wyoming to stop selecting federal grand jurors only from counties close to Cheyenne, according to U.S. District Judge Clarence Brimmer.

Currently jurors are selected from residents of Laramie, Platte, Albany and Goshen counties so jurors don't have to travel far for the sessions in Cheyenne.

But Brimmer said it appears that will have to change following last week's ruling by Utah federal Judge Aldon Anderson who stated that Wyoming's grand jury selection plan is flawed because it excludes some state residents, including people on the Wind River Indian Reservation in Fremont County.

Anderson's decision came in a Wyoming tax fraud case that was moved to Utah after all three Wyoming judges were disqualified. The defendant in the case argued the indictment against him was invalid because the Wyoming federal grand jury was chosen regionally.

Hospital plans heart institute
SPOKANE, Wash. (AP) — Nearly three decades after the first open-heart surgery in the city was performed at Sacred Heart Medical Center, hospital officials have announced plans for a \$14 million heart institute.

The project is designed to bolster Spokane's position as a regional center for heart disease treatment, an official said Wednesday.

Meanwhile, Deaconess Medical Center is seeking state permission to begin a \$16.4 million remodeling and construction project and is withdrawing from a national drug and alcohol treatment program to begin its own drug abuse treatment center.

With the spread of cardiology services to smaller communities, Sacred Heart must continue to offer the most advanced treatment and technology, hospital president Gerald Leahy said.

Tentative plans include outpatient diagnostic equipment and services for heart research and heart disease education, he said.

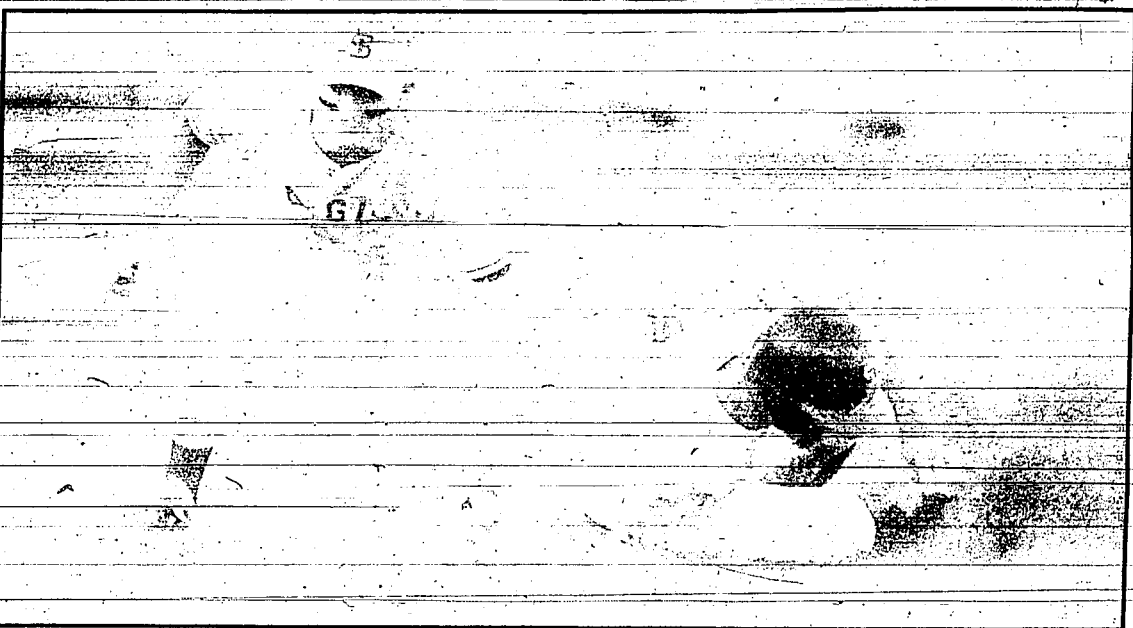
With a come-from-behind 13-9 victory over previously undefeated Hillsborough Community College of Tampa, Fla., the Eagles are in a position to win the championship of this tournament with two victories the next two nights.



It will not be easy. Tonight's roadblock is three-time defending juco champion San Jacinto North of Houston, CSI's opponent in a 7:30 p.m. contest at Stocker Stadium. The winner will play Hillsborough for the tournament title Saturday night at the same hour.

It was San Jac, a 10-0 victory over the Community College of Rhode Island in a loser-out game earlier Thursday that CSI lost twice before four years ago in becoming just the second first-belt team in history to win the junior college baseball championship. CSI had to come back through the losers' bracket in 1984 to win the title.

The victory over Hillsborough was a tribute to the CSI offense and some late relief pitching by sophomore right-hander Jim Tejeck and freshman right-hander Billy Moeller, who added a save to his two victories here.

But the CSI pitching staff may have set a dubious record for ineptitude by delivering 19 straight balls during part of the second inning, allowing the Hawks scored seven times on one hit. That started when sophomore Kendall Bennett delivered five balls before giving way to Tom Cheek, who threw 12 straight out of the strike zone before joining Bennett on the bench. Tejeck, now 5-0, then came in to throw two more before steady and ending the streak.

At that point, CSI trailed only 9-6 because of some Hillsborough wildness and two-run homers by Troy Hyman and Chris Hanks.

It took 90 minutes to play the first two innings. But then things started settling down as Tejeck took control. "I was just trying to hold them because I know our team can hit and get us back into the ballpark against anyone," Tejeck said.

Tejeck blanked Hillsborough over the next four innings. Meanwhile, John NesSmith tripled in Jeff Warren, who had singled to lead off the third inning, and followed him across when Todd Webb bounced out. An inning later, Erol Shirrer led off with a single and rode in on Hanks' second-round tripper.

Webb opened the fifth inning with a

triple before two walks and a error gave CSI the go-ahead runs. The last CSI run came in the top of the ninth when Hanks singled in Hyman.

"We got a great performance from Tejeck and another solid effort from Bill Moeller to win this one," said CSI Coach Jim Walker. "When you consider they scored those seven runs on one hit in the second inning, you have to consider the relief a pretty good job."

Walker said he was "real disappointed we did not swing the bat late in the game. We sit back and took a lot of pitches and that's not the way we

do things."

Looking toward tonight's battle with San Jac, Walker said "this one's going to be a real brawl. San Jac has the potential in just about every batting position to knock the ball out of the yard. "We felt if we could stay in the game we could win it in the fourth quarter," Dallas guard Derek Harper said. "We did that the other two games in Reunion."

The Lakers, who were behind 10-11 in the fourth quarter in Games 3 and 4 at Reunion Arena, stayed close this time but came up short when it counted.

"We gave up two key rebounds down the stretch and that killed us," guard Michael Cooper said. "Dallas had it in the fourth period and we didn't."

"You can't say the fourth period belongs to Dallas because we think we can play well at the end of the game," added James Worthy, who had 27 points for the Lakers. "But they had it tonight."

Games 7-8 Saturday at the Forum, where the defending champion Lakers are 8-1 this season and the Mavericks have lost nine straight playoff games. The winner plays the winner of the Eastern Conference final for the NBA title.

"It's sudden death. Now we have to win one in the Forum," Aguirre said. "After three 'wins' here, it's 'no-holds-barred.' We have to come out aggressively, no passive."

The Lakers, trailing 104-102, had a chance to tie the game in the final sec-

onds, but Donaldson got a hand on James Worthy's shot.

"I saw Worthy drive to the hoop and then he saw me and hesitated," Donaldson said. "I got a piece of the ball, just enough to throw his shot off."

After Donaldson was fouled with two seconds left and hit one of two free throws, Roland Brinkman fouled Magic Johnson deliberately as Johnson attempted a 3-point shot.

Johnson made the first of two free throws, then deliberately missed the second. However, the ball hit the backboard and not the rim, a violation that gave the Mavericks the ball out of bounds with one second left.

"We had a great chance there at the end but Donaldson made a good play," Worthy said.

The Lakers were upset after failing to close out the series.

"I'm disappointed," said Lakers coach Pat Riley, whose locker room

was closed for 20 minutes after the game. "We wanted to close it out. We just played a team that was committed to playing well at home."

"The home court made the difference. Our team is very angry the way the game ended. We'll have to put this behind us by tomorrow afternoon."

Blackman scored 22 points for Dallas and Harper added 17.

Byron Scott and Worthy each had 27 points for the Lakers and Johnson added 19.

Aguirre scored 12 points, including a tie-breaking pair of free throws with three seconds left, to boost the Mavs to an 82-80 edge at the end of the third quarter. Johnson had 11 points for the Lakers in the quarter.

Dallas led 55-50 at halftime although the Lakers had 11 fast-break baskets and 12 offensive rebounds.

Blackman's 18 points offset Worthy's 17 as both teams shot less than

50 percent from the field in the first two periods.

Harper's 3-point shot and Blackman's jumper in the final 74 seconds of the second quarter gave Dallas the half-time lead.

The Lakers, led by Worthy's 12 points, led 26-25 after the first quarter. Los Angeles trailed 39-42 at the end of the second quarter. Worthy had two dunks, and Scott scored on a layup to tie the score.

Donaldson and Sam Perkins connected for Dallas but Johnson and Scott tied it at 24-24.

Blackman hit one of two free throws with nine seconds left in the quarter but Green hit a jumper with one second left to give the Lakers the lead.

Dallas played without reserve forward Detlef Schrempf, who suffered a sprained ankle in Game 5.

Unseeded Swede knocks Lendl out of French Open

PARIS — It was a strange and eerie scene. On the court he had virtually owned for the last five years, Court Central at Stade Roland Garros, Ivan Lendl looked helpless. Twenty-four hours earlier, on the same court, he had put on a breathtaking display of power tennis in beating John McEnroe.

Thursday, though, "Jones" B. Svensson, the son of a Swedish dentist, inflicted one of the most painful defeats of Lendl's career, sweeping the three-time champion out of the French Open, 7-6 (7-5) 6-5, 6-2 on a day as dark and gloomy as Lendl's mood.

Lendl left the court and the tournament confused and hurt, in body and spirit. Late in the second set, when he had two set points to even the match, Lendl pulled a chest muscle stretching to hit a forehand. Before the injury, he had

struggled. After it, he faded quickly.

"I knew I was gone in the third set," he said. "All I could do was hope for a miracle."

Lendl's loss overshadowed the Steffi Graf-Gabriela Sabatini semifinal showdown, which Graf won, 6-3, 7-6 (7-3), to end a two-match losing streak against her doubles partner.

Graf, the defending champion, reached her fifth straight Grand Slam final and will be a heavy favorite Saturday against Natalia Zvereva. The 17-year-old Soviet, who upset Martina Navratilova in the round of 16, survived a match point in the final set this evening and beat unseeded Australian Nicole Provis, 6-3, 6-7 (7-3), 7-5.

Networks vie for yupscale viewers

HOLLYWOOD — Baby boomers may represent the largest segment of the population, but, somehow, when it comes to television, there just aren't enough boomers to go around.

A look at the Big Three networks and Fox Broadcasting Co.'s fall schedule shows that everybody's romancing the baby-boomer. You heard it through the grapevine last fall when ABC's "thirtysomething" became a minor hit. The rumblings got louder when that network added "The Wonder Years" and the Vietnam story "China Beach" at mid-season, complete with sound tracks laced with Top 40 hits from the '60s.

And the yuppification of the networks continues in the 1988-89 season, as programmers seek out that same golden demographic group.

Although many new shows on the slate could fall into limbo if the Writers Guild of America strike, now in its 13th week, continues, the new fall slates indicate that ABC and CBS are scrambling to follow the leader, top-rated NBC, in attracting the young, urban and affluent viewer.

Until the fall season begins and ratings numbers validate who's playing best at this not-so-trivial pursuit, network spokesmen and other industry analysts have been having a field day explaining just exactly what the other guy is doing wrong.

Nowhere is the striving to join the yupper class more apparent than at CBS. The network ended last season in third place for the first time in its history. It has since struggled back to second in the weekly ratings. CBS leads the pack with eight new shows, dominated by five sophisticated new comedies. Yuppies like sophisticated comedies (see "Cheers" in your Young Urban Professional TV Dictionary).

CBS' entertainment program "Masters" cited the network's new "Murphy Brown," which stars Candice Bergen as a Washington television reporter, as a prime-time example.

Apparently, most yups like a few yuks with their TV fare.

"I think there is a big accent on comedy, a big accent," said John Sisk, senior vice president of J. Walter Thompson advertising agency.

ABC has also preserved its most

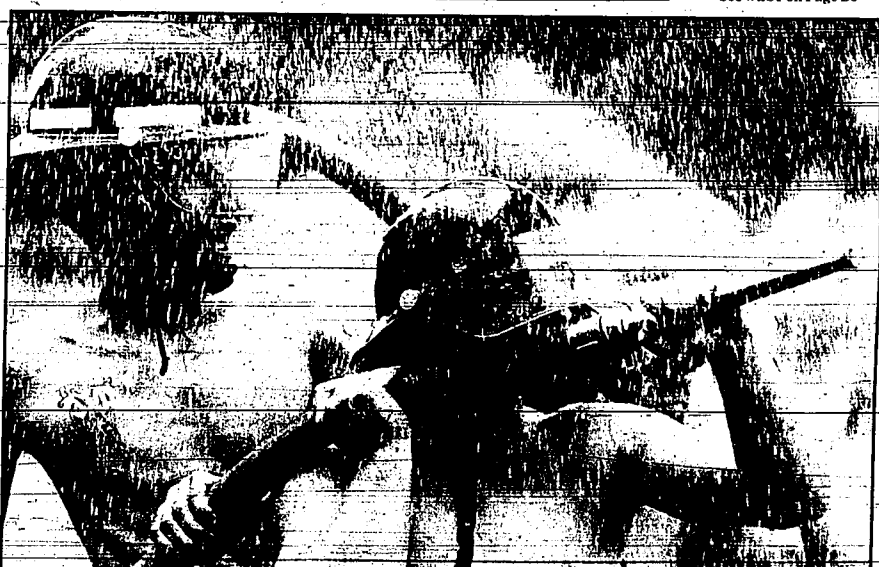

Dinosaurs roar to life in 5-year exhibit at ISU

POCATELLO — DINOMANIA 88 is a five-year exhibit at the Idaho Museum of Natural History on the Idaho State University campus.

In the first six weeks since the exhibit opened, museum officials report that more than 20,000 children and adults have taken a step into the past to see the sights and hear the sounds of a pre-historic world 150,000 million years ago.

The six moving, roaring dinosaurs are the re-creations of Dinosaur International Corp. of San Juan-Capistrano, Calif. All creatures are half-scale models of the original, ranging in size from the 10-foot-tall Tyrannosaurus to the 32-foot-long Apatosaurus (formerly known as Brontosaurus), with baby. Others dinosaurs include Triceratops and Stegosaurus as well as a flying reptile, the Pteranodon.

Movement is controlled by a computer-operated compressed air system which includes realistic movements and sound. The creatures have been placed in habitats appropriate to the time period in which they lived, compliments of ISU art students.

The exhibit will change each year, replacing four of the six original

models. Dinomania offers this program to only four or five universities museums in the United States on the basis of emphasis in paleontology and high visitation potential. The Idaho Museum of Natural History was selected for the museum's unique exhibits and collections, including the Vertebrate Paleontology Collection which is the 15th largest in the nation, and Pocatello's proximity to tourist destinations such as Yellowstone/Grand Teton National Parks, Craters of the Moon National Monument and Sun Valley.

DINOMANIA 88 is open seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Now, during the summer, and until Sept. 30, hours will be extended to 7 p.m. Wednesday through Saturday. Entrance fees are \$2.50 for adults, \$2 for seniors, \$1.50 for children under 12 and 75 cents for school children on group tours. Bookings for group tours for the 1988-89 school year will be taken in August. Call Rebecca Burton at 236-2195.

Continued from Page D1 As the children charged down the entrance hall and rounded a corner to come face to face with Stegosaurus, their eyes widened like full moons and their mouths dropped open. The youngsters stood motionless as the creature roared and swung his spiked tail.

What is it about these creatures of the past that fosters a fascination and generates an inquisitiveness in young children?

Museum director Dr. Wallace Stefan, offered several interesting insights. "They're large. They're scary. It's something the kids have read and fantasized about," he said. "Dinosaurs are appealing because since they are no longer around, they're not nightmarish."

He said some studies suggest dinosaurs appeal to children comes about because they represent monsters that actually lived, but the chance of children being harmed by the giants is nonexistent because there's no possibility they'll return to life.

"Kids like to exaggerate," Stefan said. Perhaps these larger-than-life creatures give children, who know they are small figures in a grown-up's world, the chance to visualize themselves as "big" by identifying with dinosaurs.

But perhaps there's another key to the reason why children, as well as adults, find dinosaurs so fascinating. It's fitting the pieces of a teasing, tantalizing puzzle together, one that has many of the pieces missing. Scientists can only guess at certain aspects of the dinosaurs, such as what color they were, what sounds they made and the biggest question of all, why they became extinct?

Continued from Page D1 yup-peeling — shows "thirtysomething," "China Beach," "Hooperman" and "The Wonder Years" all reappear on the schedule.

I think that there is an upscaling going on. LeMasters told the Los Angeles Times, "If I had my way on television, I think it's that. All three networks have put some more upscale shows on."

I suppose we (CBS) lead this season with the "Murphy Browns" of the world," LeMasters continued. "On NBC, 'Tattinger's' (about a New York restaurateur and from the creators of 'St. Elsewhere', I'm led to believe, is very upscale. ABC's 'Wonder Years' I would consider upscale, even though it's a period piece, and ABC's 'China Beach' is upscale."

The trend toward "upscale" programming — which usually draws sponsors with products aimed at the affluent yuppie market — is underscored by the abundance of classic pop music in the new season's shows. ABC's midseason series, "China Beach" and "The Wonder Years," and the Viacom series "Four of a Kind" all feature '60s music. Topping the charts, no doubt, will be CBS' new "Dirty Dancing," based on the hit movie about coming of age at a summer resort.

The burst of TV interest in '60s music and culture — besides appealing to that audience aged thirtysomething — is predictable, said LeMasters. "When you approach the '90s, when any century is coming to an end, there

is always a period of restoration," he said. "As you close to it, people begin to pick up things from the past 100 years. At first blush, it seems that shows like 'Wonder Years' speak to that restoration."

One generation that spoke to the young, upscale viewers didn't speak loudly enough, apparently. The only "dramedy" left on the fall schedule is ABC's "Hooperman." LeMasters vowed to bring back "Frank's Place," the most enigmatic of the dramedies, as soon as possible, although it's not in the lineup now.

"It makes me crazy that I don't have this on the air, it is such a wonderful show," he said. "What I don't want to have happen is to put it on the air in a slot where it gets ignored, and we just can't get the audience to come there."

Industry observers split over which network will attract the most yuppies next fall.

NBC entertainment chief Brandon Tartikoff in a press conference last week said that while ABC's schedule appeals to the young viewer, its focus is too narrow. "Whether those shows ('thirtysomething,' 'China Beach,' etc.) turn out to be broad-based hits, I just think it's a little early to tell. So far, not a one of them has become a bona-fide hit, and I think for a network to get out of a rut ... what you need are hits."

LeMasters agreed with Tartikoff — which is one reason the CBS schedule still includes shows like "Paradise," a drama about an 1890s

gunslinger, on its new fall schedule; period dramas, particularly Westerns, are guaranteed to attract some older viewers. Even the yuppie-comedy "Murphy Brown," LeMasters said, is stylish enough to appeal to older watchers.

"I think the danger is that they are small figures in a grown-up's world, the chance to visualize themselves as 'big' by identifying with dinosaurs."

The CBS programmer thinks that while ABC might be peddling too much yuppie fare, NBC might be making the opposite mistake. "At first bounce it seems like they're becoming older — they're not trying to grow younger," he said.

"They have taken a show like 'Dear John' (starring Judd Hirsch as a newly single bachelor), which at first blush looks like it's going to have an older appeal to it, and moved it into their Thursday-night lineup," he said.

Americans return in nominations for the 42nd Annual Tony Awards

By Evan Levine

In 1947, the first Tony Awards were handed out. Elia Kazan won as Best Director for "All My Sons." No award for Best Play was given: The winners received a scroll and a compact or a cigarette lighter.

This year, Tonys in more than 20 categories will be awarded, chosen from among a field of more than 80 nominees. And while the big news last year was the dominance of British imports, this year "The 42nd Annual Tony Awards" has a strong field of American entries to choose among. Angela Lansbury hosts the ceremony, airing Sunday, June 5 on CBS.

The British influence is still felt, however. Andrew Lloyd Webber, who has been responsible for such past hits as "Cats," is represented this year by "Phantom of the Opera," a leading contender for Best Musical. The story of a figure who haunts the Paris Opera has captured several nominations. Despite a weariness with "factory" British musicals, it is also the most popular of the nominees.

Other nominees for Best Musical include "Sarafina!" "Romance, Romance" and Stephen Sondheim's fairy tale-like "Into the Woods." "Into the Woods" may have an outside shot at winning this category, depending on the strength of the anti-British backlash.

Michael Crawford, who started out in the movie "Hello, Dolly!" gives a rich performance as the Phantom; he is an almost sure winner for Best Actor in a Musical. His competition includes Scott Bakula for "Romance, Romance" and David Carroll for "Chess"; but neither have the presence that is usually needed to carry

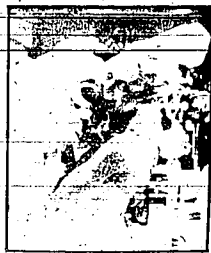

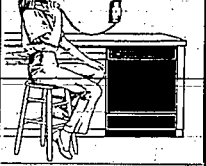

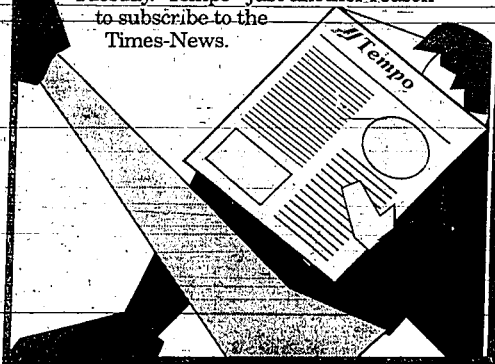

CBS preserves news hours, adds comedies; 'Cagney & Lacey' out

NEW YORK — Mary Tyler Moore and Dick Van Dyke will be back on CBS in separate new series this fall, but "Cagney & Lacey" are gone.

Also canceled are "Houston Knights," "High Mountain Rangers," "Eisenhower & Lutz" and "The Smothers Brothers Comedy Hour."

"The decision to cancel the Emmy-winning drama 'Cagney & Lacey' was a close call and was not made until Tuesday," said CBS President Kim LeMasters. "But the show had suffered the slings and arrows. We felt it was time for it to go off before it got beaten up more."

"Cagney & Lacey" was canceled in 1983, but CBS brought it back after a letter-writing campaign by fans.

The critically praised series "Frank's Place" isn't in the fall lineup, but LeMasters said it would return next season as soon as there is a protected time period where it can stay put. "Kate & Allie" and "Jake and the Fatman" are also being held until later in the season.

Taking "Frank's Place" off the schedule was "one of the toughest decisions I had to make," said LeMasters. "It's an extraordinary show. But what it boiled down to was, would I put it on the schedule to be bounced around, or would I take the heat and hold it for an advantageous time period?"

Other shows that were new in 1987 that did make the second-season slate were "Coming of Age," a mid-season replacement, "Wiseguy," "Beauty and the Beast" and "Tour of Duty."

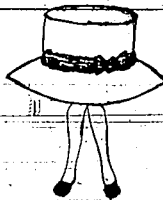

away the award.

Notably absent among the nominees for Best Actress in a Musical are Bernadette Peters for "Into the Woods" and Sarah Brightman (Lloyd Webber's wife) for "Phantom of the Opera." Joanna Gleason is a strong contender for "Into the Woods," as is Judy Kuhn, who was roundly acclaimed for her performance in "Chess." But that show was poorly received, and her relative anonymity may be a further handicap.

For Best Play, David Henry Hwang's "M. Butterfly" is the hottest contender. The fact-based story of a 20-year affair between a French diplomat and a Peking Opera star who turns out to be a man has been praised for its exploration of politics and relationships. "Speed-the-Flow," which boasts the presence of Madon-

na; presents a scathing look at Hollywood—it offers the lightning-fast dialogue of David Mamet, but is considered too esoteric to have wide appeal. "A Walk in the Woods," which focuses on Soviet-American relations, opened to mixed reviews. And "Joe Turner's Come and Gone" is by August Wilson, last year's winner for "Fences." It would be unusual for him to win two years in a row.

If there is any sort of sweep in which one or two shows take a slew of awards, "Phantom of the Opera" and "M. Butterfly" seem likely choices. Propelled by word of mouth, critical praise and momentum, they only need that final award to insure their status.
