## Bush launches quest for White House

NEW ORLEANS — George Bush aggressively launched his quest for the White House Thursday night, depicting himself as the underdog in the race against Michael Dukakis and pledging to "run hard, to fight hard, to stand on the issues."  
"And I mean to win," he told cheering delegates at the Republican National Convention.

The packed Superdome erupted into noisy demonstrations before Bush spoke and again afterwards. Delegates waved American flags, raised their campaign banners and chanted "eight more years."  
Convention managers had boasted for days about the blizzard of balloons they would release, and it was spectacular — thousands rising from below the podium meeting thousands more falling from the ceiling. Followed by confetti.

The four-day GOP rally ended with the traditional unity scene at the podium. Bush and his family joined by running mate Dan Quayle and his wife and children and the rest of the party establishment. All joined the delegates in singing "God Bless America."  
Bush spoke after delegates ratified his selection of Quayle as ticketmate. The Indiana senator mentioned his Vietnam era service in the National Guard, saying, "I am proud of it" — the sole refer-

enced to the controversy that dogged the 41-year-old lawmaker on the final day of the GOP convention.  
"I'm proud to have Dan Quayle at my side," said Bush.  
GOP convention week polls charted a dwindling Democratic lead in the fall campaign as the vice president addressed the delegates and a TV audience numbering in the millions.  
He portrayed the past eight years as an era of peace and prosperity, saying

repeatedly, "I'm not going to let them take it away from you."  
He said no to taxes and abortion, and said he favored a drug-free America where each child can attend a first-rate school. He said he would be a "patient friend to anyone, east or west, who will fight for freedom."  
The vice president began his speech with a self-deprecating touch, saying, "I'll try to keep my charisma in check."

## Family connection to National Guard plagues Quayle

NEW ORLEANS — Even as he became the Republican vice presidential nominee Thursday, Dan Quayle was mired in controversy after it was disclosed that a family connection helped him join the National Guard at the height of the Vietnam War.  
Top aides to presidential nominee George Bush met during the day to discuss ways to quell the furor, as campaign spokeswoman Alice Glen declared, "Not a simple thought is being given to changing the ticket."  
Criticism heard outside the Superdome was weighed against delegates' enthusiastic demonstrations inside the hall. Quayle

added several lines to his acceptance speech to make his defiant stand clear and the crowd erupted in applause.  
"As a young man, I served six years in the National Guard. And, like the millions of Americans who have served in the Guard... I am proud of it," Quayle said.  
"I'm proud to have Dan Quayle at my side," Bush told the delegates as he accepted the top spot on the ticket.  
"What should have been a triumphant day for the second-term Indiana senator was instead full of hurried meetings and wild rumors as the story of his military service unfolded."

## EEOC settles age bias suit for \$35 million deal

PITTSBURGH — The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission said Thursday it reached what appears to be its largest cash settlement in an employment discrimination case, a \$35 million deal with Westinghouse Electric Corp.  
EEOC negotiators were armed with U.S. District Court rulings that Westinghouse violated the Age Discrimination in Employment Act when it denied sever-

ance pay to employees who were eligible for pensions at the time their jobs were eliminated in plant closings.  
"We broke some new ground," said EEOC General Counsel Charles Shanor. "The district court held that forcing a pension-eligible employee to choose between the pension and severance is unlawful."  
Westinghouse estimates that 4,000 former workers should share the \$35 million, an estimate that is being reviewed.

## Milner Dam project backers swamp foes

**TWIN FALLS** — Supporters of the Milner Dam hydroelectric project swamped opponents with arguments in favor of a Thursday night meeting before the federal dam licensing agency.  
Federal Energy Regulatory Commission staff meeting at the Holiday Inn heard farmers portray the Milner project as vital to the economic health of the Magic Valley. Nine of the first 12 speakers supported the project.  
At issue is the proposal by Twin Falls and North Side canal companies to use revenues from electricity sales to pay for the \$7 to \$12 million in dam repairs.  
Otherwise, the companies say, farmers must bear the repair themselves, which will raise the price of water.  
Whitewater enthusiasts asked the farmers to expand their view beyond agriculture and look to the recreation needs of the area. If FERC gives the canal companies a license for the project, they said to build at Milner, whitewater flows for kayakers would be reduced.  
One of those days the people of this country will have to give up fish and other things if they have to live on the lower end of Charles Dam at Twin Falls. Harris supports the Milner project and the use of the Snake River for hydro development.

If people want more recreation, they should build more water storage upstream of Milner and pay for it, he said.  
Rob Lesser of the Idaho Whitewater Association said if farmers have to pay an additional \$5 per acre for water to cover Milner repairs, it is only fair after 83 years of benefiting from the dam.  
"Four dollars is a burden," Lesser said. "We are bearing the burden as taxpayers in other circumstances such as drought relief." Bringing the dam up to 1988 standards is essential, he said, but this is not just to meet the needs of irrigators but also recreation interests and fish and wildlife preservation.  
Idaho Whitewater is opposed to the Milner project as proposed by the canal companies but it would support the FERC staff's initial proposal of placing a power turbine in the dam. This would allow greater flows for recreation use. The canal companies say this is unreasonable. FERC staff is looking at the canal companies' alternative of placing a turbine 1.6 miles downstream from the dam where the water there for hydropower would be greater.

multi-stem of the Snake River. FERC is also looking at new information about Idaho Power Co.'s planned Twin Falls power plant expansion.  
In 1987 FERC issued a draft environmental impact statement that said Milner was unfeasible as proposed by the canal companies. The statement drew howls of protests from the canal companies and Idaho Power Co. FERC said it would issue a supplement to the November 1987 statement.  
"Though projects at Star Falls at Murlough and Auger Falls near Jerome are also on tap, Milner dominated most of the discussion at afternoon and evening meetings attended by a total of 100 people."  
Tom Prescott, a Jerome rancher, said his operation would be unprofitable without Milner and its water in the fall, spring and summer.  
"I am against my water we would lose with bypass flows. We all love recreation. When we compare it with farming and ranching, it doesn't amount to much," Prescott said.  
"The Twin Falls County Parks Advisory Committee is opposed to any new hydro developments on the Snake," said spokesman Robert Johnson.  
"Star Falls is much too scenic for development of hydroelectricity," he said.  
Lloyd Little of Gooding, manager of Wandell grain elevators, said he supports Milner as vital to the survival of the Magic Valley's agriculture.

## Frequent flier takes youths to California

LOS ANGELES — Twenty-five wide-eyed kids from Georgia, beneficiaries of a man who took an airline promotion seriously, began a four-day Southern California fling Thursday with a backstage look at Hollywood.

## Coastal states lead gains in Americans' incomes in '87

WASHINGTON — Regional disparities in personal incomes widened in 1987, as booming coastal states continued to outstrip wage gains in much of the rest of the nation, the government reported Thursday.  
The Commerce Department said all 10 of the states with the highest average personal incomes last year were on the nation's coast, eight along the Atlantic and Alaska and California on the Pacific.

Connecticut ranked No. 1 with residents earning \$21,286 for every adult and child last year, an increase of 8.8 percent over 1986.  
For the nation as a whole, incomes rose 6 percent to an average of \$15,461 last year, the best overall performance since a similar 6 percent gain in 1985.  
Incomes had risen 5.1 percent in 1986. Idaho ranked 46th on the list with a per capita income of \$11,868. Still, that was 6.2 percent above the 1986 figure.

Seven of the 10 states with the lowest incomes were in the South, with Mississippi ranked last. The per capita income in that state was \$10,292, an increase of 6.5 percent over the previous year.  
Thursday's report was based on revised figures that showed incomes overall grew at a stronger pace than estimated when the original report was released in April. At that time, the government said national per capita incomes rose 4.8 percent, barely ahead of

the 4.4 percent rise in consumer prices last year.  
After Connecticut, New Jersey — with an average income of \$20,352 — had the second highest incomes.  
They were followed by Massachusetts, with an average of \$19,142; Alaska, \$18,230; and Maryland, \$18,124. Rounding out the top 10 were New York, California, New Hampshire, Delaware and Virginia.  
In addition to Mississippi, states with

the lowest incomes were West Virginia, with an average of \$11,020; followed by Utah, Louisiana, Arkansas, Idaho, New Mexico, Alabama, South Carolina and Kentucky.  
The new figures confirmed other studies that have shown wide geographic differences in how the country has benefited from the current economic expansion.  
In contrast to most recovery periods, regional differences have widened rather than narrowed, the report said.

Pakistani military suspects bomb or missile downed Zia's aircraft

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan — The top military command in Pakistan strongly suspected a missile, possibly a Soviet-made C-130, was responsible for the midair explosion Wednesday that killed President Zia-ul-Haq, U.S. Ambassador Arnold L. Raphael and 10 of Zia's top generals, the chief of the Pakistani air force said Thursday.

The military's preliminary investigation has found that mechanical failure could not have caused the explosion that destroyed Zia's C-130 air force transport. Air Marshal Hakimullah Khan said in a brief interview as coffins containing the bodies of the dead arrived in the capital. The crash occurred moments after take-off from the desert town of Bahawalpur, 350 miles south of the capital of Islamabad.

Asked whether the military believed that a bomb or missile was responsible, he replied, "It could not be anything else." Khan refused, however, to speculate on who might have sabotaged the plane. In Washington, a senior U.S. official said Thursday, "There is no confirmation of any foul play, but we are not taking anything for granted."

Expected to arrive at the crash site, about 60 miles from the Indian border, today, the C-130 was not equipped with a "black box," the automatic recording device required on civilian airliners. As Khan declared that "we want to make all efforts to find out the truth," Pakistani air force planes arrived at the crash site carrying the remains of Raphael, U.S. Army Brig. Gen. Herbert M. Wassman, the American defense attache here, and 23 of the 28 Pakistani military officers killed in the crash.

Gen. Mirza Aslam Beg, who became army chief of staff upon Zia's death, confirmed during the arrival ceremony that the final death toll from the disaster was 30 — 17 passengers and 13 crew members. Initial reports indicated that 37 people had been aboard the plane.

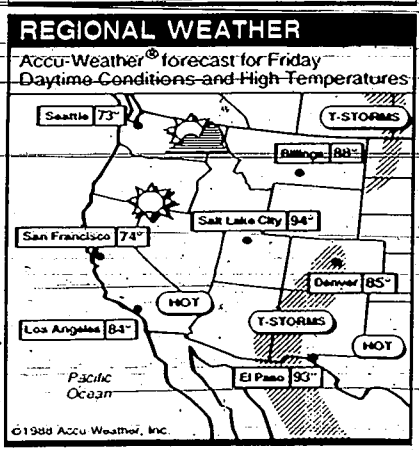
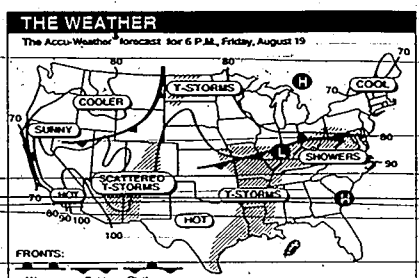

"Quayle can do one of two things: admit this and that he was a liar ... or he can withdraw from the race."

# Idaho delegates applaud Bush's showing

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Idaho delegates said on Thursday that George Bush's performance at the Republican National Convention boosted his chances for the White House.

They predicted that revelations that Bush's running mate, Sen. Dan Quayle, might have used family influence to get into the national guard would not harm the ticket.

"Had he avoided service, I would have grave questions. He did what many of my friends did. They enlisted in the guard of the Air Force or the Coast Guard or Navy," said Chuck Lempius of Post Falls. "The point is, he served. He's not a draft dodger."

A retired executive of oil firms,

paper chain owned by Quayle's family says he made calls to the Indiana National Guard on Quayle's behalf in 1969, when the guard had a waiting list of 100,000.

With the convention nearing its close, the debate over Quayle's military record did not dampen the Idaho delegation's optimism for a Republican victory.

Delegates were confident a Bush-Quayle ticket would carry Idaho, which gave Ronald Reagan his second largest percentages in 1980 and 1984.

The vice president was scheduled tonight to deliver his acceptance speech to cap the four-day convention.

"You can't help but get en-

thusiast," said Lempius. "It is a presidential election. This puts it all together."

Idaho Republican Party Chairman Blake Hall, also delegation chairman, said Bush had partly removed the negative image that has plagued his campaign.

"America has had an opportunity the last few days here to get better acquainted with George Bush," said Hall. "A clear distinction has been drawn between George Bush and the candidate of the Democrats."

Gary Glenn, an alternate from Boise, said the image portrayed of Bush's political family marriage strategy leader should persuade Americans that he is qualified to lead America.

Glenn, who helped engineer a successful campaign to pass Idaho's right to work law in 1986, said Bush needs to emphasize his positions on federal land management, aid to the Contra rebels in Nicaragua and other issues important to conservatives.

"There's only one thing George Bush needs to do to win, and that is to continue to expose Michael Dukakis' philosophy," Glenn said. "I do not believe the people who elected Ronald Reagan by landslide majorities will turn around and elect a man who is the exact opposite."

# Crews struggle with wilderness blaze

Two expert "hotshot" fire crews from Arizona continued working Thursday to complete a break line in front of the 260-acre Ladder Creek blaze in Idaho's Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness.

Meanwhile, the Ada County Sheriff's Department searched for a man believed to have started at least five fires in the Boise foothills.

Ada County Undersheriff Dee Pfeiffer said at least five of the 10 fires reported in the block the advance of the Ladder Creek fire, about 20 miles southeast of Elk City, but Ms. Zabinaki said officials were depending primarily on natural barriers like creeks and ridges to keep the fire in check.

The expected time of control on the 132-acre Green Creek Point fire, burning in an active timber sale 14 miles east of Grangeville, was set back from Thursday to Friday, Ms. Zabinaki said.

That blaze was contained late Tuesday, but about 140 people continued on Thursday to mop up hot spots.

# Court sets rules of criminal testimony

BOISE (AP) — Unless it is to show a connection with a "plot" or connected activity, a judge should not allow testimony in a criminal trial of other, uncharged crimes, the Idaho Court of Appeals says.

The court on Thursday unanimously threw out the burglary

and grand theft convictions of two Kootenai County men. The court ruled their rights were prejudiced when the judge allowed an alleged accomplice to testify about several other burglaries, crimes the men were not charged with.

The defendants were Roy Bussard and David Mason. The case was sent back to lower court. But at the same time, the Court of Appeals rejected most of the men's arguments that evidence was improperly seized.

An alleged accomplice, John Davis, testified that he, Bussard and Mason committed six or seven burglaries together. Bussard and Mason were charged with only two.

The Court of Appeals said evidence of other, uncharged crimes can be admitted if it is shown they are part of a "common scheme or plan."

"In the present case, the prior burglaries and the crimes charged were not shown to be the progressive stages of a single plan formed in the minds of the defendants," said Justice Donald Burnett.

"Rather, each crime was self-contained; one was not a step toward the others. The crimes were connected only in the sense that they shared the common goal of getting money," he said.

The court noted that goods stolen in the burglaries were found in Mason's house and Bussard's car, but that alone was not enough to conclude that the defendants engaged in burglaries.

# Idahoans help Midwest farmers

LEWISTON (AP) — Minnesota farmer Arthur Pratt figured that since the hay wasn't coming to him because of the Midwest drought, he was going to the hay.

His farm at Clanssa, Minn., had yielded only about 2,000 bales of hay. And that would not last long with about 100 head of dairy cattle eating a ton of hay a day. A couple of months, maybe.

So Pratt, his son, and a neighboring farmer drove 1,300 miles to Idaho.

Pratt's brothers, Ole, Vern and Roy Pratt, live at Moscow, Idaho, and knew two farmers with several hundred acres of Conservation Reserve Program lands. These fields officially are out of production, but the federal government is allowing harvesting of the hay crops for farmers suffering the impact of the

drought.

Robert Callihan and Frank Dolyns, the landowners, also cut the hay, and Pratt and his crew raked and baled it. On Wednesday, they started loading 5,000 bales of hay into seven boxcars donated by Burlington Northern Railroad to take the crop back to Pratt's hungry herd.

The trip definitely was worthwhile, Pratt said.

"In our area there's virtually no hay for sale," he said. "It's too bad more people didn't get out here. There's lots and lots of good hay that's not to waste here."

In Winchester and Craigmont, a group of farmers worked Wednesday to send some of their hay to the Midwest. They had harvested 60 acres of CRP land owned by Bony Land and Cattle Co.

## American conservatives caught between pair of millstones

One of the more eloquent Republicans to the sad dismay of the Republican conservatives was their reported election the choice of Indiana Sen. Dan Quayle by Vice President George Bush as his running mate.

Bush deserves a good deal of credit for political astuteness in picking Quayle, because the selection gives him continuity with the conservatives without pandering to them by selecting one of their darlings. Had he chosen almost any other prominent conservative, he would have had a tiger by the tail. Rep. Jack Kemp, R-N.Y., a man whom Bush reportedly cannot abide, is a true believer in a variety of economic nostrums that Bush regards as harebrained. Former U.N. Ambassador Jeane Kirkpatrick, the "Patriarcha of the American right," is still in her pre-glasnost fighting crouch and might upstage and embarrass the less combative Bush in the one area in which he claims unchallenged supremacy over Democratic presidential nominee Michael

S. Dukakis — foreign affairs. As for Sen. Bob Dole, R-Kan., he no longer is seen by many conservatives as one of their own. Rather, he is regarded as a man who has been hopelessly compromised by the moderate give-and-take of Senate politics and whose sallies at liberalism seem to be more cantankerous than pointed.

The quinescence of this most raucous group of Republicans at New Orleans has been the most notable feature of a convention that has generally been devoid of benchmark events. The leadership of the once-mighty right has fallen to New Hampshire's Sen. Gordon J. Humphrey, a man unlikely to be confused with the Granite State's

great statesman, Daniel Webster. Humphrey's setting of the proceedings has been cranky and episodic rather than passionate and sustained. The right wing's favorite senator, Jesse Helms of North Carolina, has been invisible in New Orleans, and such ideological enforcers as Patrick Buchanan have chosen to take the high road of political commentary.

## Veterans say Guard service was 'cushy'

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — The spokesman for the Vietnam Veterans of America said Thursday that National Guard service was regarded as "cushy duty" to avoid the draft and that questions about Dan Quayle's military service were relevant.

Mike Leaveck, director of public relations for the Vietnam Veterans of America, said his organization has received several dozen calls from members "upset" about revelations about Quayle's National Guard record.

"Questions about what did you do during the Vietnam War, we think, are very relevant for anyone in public life, particularly of our

generation," Leaveck said in a telephone interview from the group's Washington headquarters.

"A lot of people served in the National Guard during those years, a lot of them served in the National Guard in order to avoid military service in Vietnam. That's a well known, accepted fact. We can't comment on what his motivations may have been. A lot of people went into the National Guard because they liked it."

But, he added, "actually the National Guard was considered cushy duty. ... We've had a lot of calls from our members who are upset."

## Parkinson denies affair

WASHINGTON (AP) — Paula Parkinson, the woman who held center stage in the sex-and-influence scandal that briefly touched Dan Quayle, says she never had an affair with the senator and is tired of talking about it.

"She didn't sleep with Quayle," said society columnist Rudy Maxa, Mrs. Parkinson's longtime confidant. He is now acting as an informal spokesman for Mrs. Parkinson, who once worked as a Capitol Hill lobbyist for an insurance industry group.

Quayle, lapped by George Bush for the No. 2 spot on the Republican ticket, was one of three congressmen who shared a cottage with Mrs. Parkinson during a January 1980 golf vacation in Atlantis, Fla. Quayle has said he did not have an affair with her.

"That has been covered and there is nothing to it," Quayle told a news conference Wednesday at the Republican convention in New Orleans.

## Wind fans Montana fire

HELENA, Mont. (AP) — Shifting wind abruptly fanned a week-old fire in the mountains on the outskirts of Helena, quadrupling the blaze to 20,000 acres, burning at least five homes and forcing dozens of residents to flee, authorities said Thursday.

"When I saw that that wall-of-flame, all I wanted to do was get out," said Carol Williams, one of at least 55 people ordered out of their homes late Wednesday night in a mountain area 15 miles south of Helena.

Authorities warned an additional 400 to 500 people in the nearby Saddle Mountain subdivision they might have to evacuate. The homes are on large, wooded lots several hundred yards from each other.

The Warm Springs blaze began when a four-wheel-drive vehicle caught fire Aug. 9. Wind changed the fire's direction Wednesday evening from the east to the north, and flames quickly burned a 3-mile-wide swath, fire officials said.

The fire grew to 17,000 acres by Thursday morning, up from about

5,000 acres the day before. By Thursday afternoon, it was estimated at 20,000 acres. Officials had no estimate of when the fire might be contained.

"The fire burned heavily all through the night," said Anne Jeffery, a fire information officer. Elsewhere in Montana, firefighters battled blazes covering more than 15,000 acres, while fires also continued at Yellowstone Park in Wyoming and other parts of the West.

Nearly 2,000 firefighters from at least 15 states were battling the blaze near Helena, said Bobb Lawrence, a fire foreman in the Department of State Lands. Firefighting costs had reached \$1.5 million.

Assisting were three airplanes dropping fire retardant, 10 helicopters, 12 bulldozers, at least 25 pumper trucks and six water supply trucks. The Montana National Guard was not activated, but 20 guard volunteers were helping fight the fire, and guard trucks and helicopters were being used.

## Small quake hits Utah

PRICE, Utah (AP) — A small earthquake, an aftershock of a series of quakes on Sunday, was felt Thursday in central Utah, but there were no reports of damage or injury.

The magnitude of the 6.44 a.m. quake was 4.6 on the Richter scale, said Jim Pechmann, a seismologist at the University of Utah's Seismograph Stations.

A second tremor, 1.0 magnitude, was recorded in the same area at 6:55 a.m., the university said.

The Carbon County sheriff's office said it received numerous calls, and there were reports of the tremor be-

ing felt in Emery and Sanpete counties. The tremors occurred in an area where there had been no known faults.

# Shuttle booster passes last test

BRIGHAM CITY, Utah (AP) — An intentionally flawed space shuttle booster was successfully fired Thursday in the last of a series of tests required before resumption of manned U.S. space flights.

If engineers deemed the test a success after inspecting the prone rocket, and NASA workers are able to plug a tiny fuel leak in the shuttle *Discovery*, the space agency will be able to set a firm date in late September or early October for the first shuttle launch in 32 months.

The two-minute horizontal test firing, the fifth full-scale test of Morton Thiokol's redesigned booster, sent clouds of dust billowing thousands of feet in the air as hundreds of NASA and company observers cheered.

"Fantastic! It looked really good. This is it," said John Thrill, vice president of space operations for Morton Thiokol.

Morton Thiokol and NASA engineers expected preliminary test results within hours and final results within two weeks, said company spokesman Rocky Rab.

Meanwhile, technicians at Cape Canaveral, Fla., drilled holes in *Discovery's* cargo bay wall and an engine compartment Thursday in an attempt to stem

a tiny leak in a fuel line. The repair and subsequent testing are expected to take about a week, said NASA spokeswoman Lisa Malone.

Royce Mitchell, solid rocket motor project manager for Marshall Space Center in Huntsville, Ala., called Thursday's firing a "redundancy verification test" to make sure the booster's new joints do what they're supposed to do: contain super-heated gases during launch.

If there was no leak, Mitchell said, "we will have demonstrated it's a fail-safe design." With the \$470 million redesign and motor testing, he said, Morton Thiokol has run five or six times the number of tests done prior to the first shuttle launch, and in half the time.

David Ewing, the company's deputy director of program management, called the redesign result "very, very robust. We've put on the belt and suspenders and we've even added garters."

The test firing at Morton Thiokol's test bay 25 miles west of here capped the company's 2-year effort to revamp the rocket blamed for the January 1986 explosion that destroyed *Challenger*, killed its seven-member crew and grounded the nation's space program.

# White House halts help in drug probe

WASHINGTON (AP) — The White House has halted cooperation with a congressional study of alleged drug trafficking by Panamanian ruler Manuel Antonio Noriega, administration and congressional officials confirmed Thursday.

In Miami, Democratic presidential nominee Michael Dukakis accused the administration of "stonewalling" the General Accounting Office probe, which automatically could drive into Republican nominee George Bush's knowledge about the Noriega case. Administration officials argued they needed time to "review" the GAO's requests for information.

"I think the White House does not want to cooperate because they are embarrassed by this," Dukakis said.

Nancy R. Kingsbury, who is directing the study by the GAO, Congress' investigative agency, said the administration's total lack of cooperation is unusual.

East Coast Convention Branch disputes focused on specific documents, she noted.

The order not to cooperate, until further notice, came from Nicholas Rostow, special assistant to the president and legal adviser at the National Security Council, according to Ms. Kingsbury.

# Polish strikes bring mining, shipping, transport to a halt

**JASTRZEBIE, Poland (AP)** — A rising tide of labor unrest Thursday crippled production at five vital coal mines and paralyzed port operations and public transport in the city of Szczecin, opposition leaders said.

The workers are demanding the restoration of legal status for the banned Solidarity trade union federation, higher wages and improved

working conditions.

The strikes, which began when miners occupied the July Manifesto mine near Jastrzebie in southwestern Poland on Tuesday, spread Thursday to a fifth mine.

Transportation workers in Szczecin also stopped work Thursday, joining dock workers on strike in the city which is the nation's second largest

port after Gdansk.

Solidarity leader Lech Walesa, in his first statement on the strikes, expressed support for the "just struggle."

The communist government, which crushed Solidarity in a military crackdown in 1981, denounced the strikes and declared them illegal.

Workers at the Jastrzebie Mine

went on strike Thursday, said Jerzy Szydelski, its director. He said he did not have any details on how many workers were involved.

About 600 bus drivers and other employees of Szczecin's municipal transport system walked off the job Thursday morning, snarling bus services.

About 2,000 dock workers remained

on strike in the city, said Solidarity spokesman Wojciech Mazianki. General cargo operations were at a standstill, witnesses said.

"I support the just struggle of the miners, port workers and other strikers," Walesa said from Gdansk. "This is the only way to lead Poland on the road to reforms. The workers are defending Solidarity because it is for

them the key condition of preparing winning and carrying out economic and political reforms."

More than 2,000 workers occupied the Andaluzja coal mine in Piekary Slaskie on Wednesday night, mine officials and Solidarity activists said.

The Andaluzja mine is located about 42 miles northeast of the three other mines now closed in Silesia.

## Israel bans activist groups

**JERUSALEM (AP)** — Israel on Thursday outlawed grass-roots committees that carry out the orders of the Palestinian uprising's leaders, and Red Cross and hospital officials said troops beat more than 250 Arabs in four days of unrest in the occupied Gaza Strip.

Also on Thursday, Palestinians launched a two-day general strike in the West Bank to protest Israel's policy of deporting those it deems activists in the eight-month uprising. Word of the impromptu strike was passed around the West Bank by masked youths, many of whom shouted their message on loudspeakers.

A three-day curfew was lifted before dawn Thursday from much of the Gaza Strip, but 180,000 Arabs in 11 refugee camps and neighborhoods remained confined to their homes. In addition, 85,000 West Bank Palestinians from nine villages and camps were under curfew.

Israeli troops shot and wounded two Palestinian teenagers in the West Bank village of Tamun and a third in Gaza's Burej refugee camp, hospital officials said. The army confirmed two wounded in Tamun and said the shootings occurred after the Arabs attacked an army patrol with knives.

In a 16-page report, Amnesty International said Israeli troops have beaten thousands of Palestinians since the uprising began in December.

The Foreign Ministry said it was checking the allegations, but added that the London-based human rights group had conferred with biased sources.

Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin said his decision to outlaw the popular committees would create legal means of "dealing with the activists" of the Palestinian uprising.

The Defense Ministry said every Palestinian who continues to be a member of the committees or assist them would be arrested and put on trial. Israel radio said 10-year prison terms would be imposed.

## Zoologists search for snowman

**MOSCOW (AP)** — Zoologists are heading to Siberia to search for the abominable snowman, while remains of a mammoth have been found elsewhere in the frozen expanse, news reports said Thursday.

The official news agency Tass said fishermen from the Siberian city of Yakutsk discovered the fossilized mammoth in permafrost near the Khroma and Indigirka rivers. Scientists said the skeleton was well preserved because it had been frozen in the ground for at least 15,000 years in northwestern Siberia.


The remains soon will be taken to Yakutsk, where they will be assembled, Tass said.

The newspaper Socialist Industry reported that 12 scientists, sportsmen and enthusiasts planned to search in the Tyumen region of western Siberia for the abominable snowman.

The expedition will follow the same route that a Leningrad explorer used several years ago. The explorer, Vladimir Pushkaryov, disappeared in the region while interviewing residents who tell legends about the mysterious creature, they call Kompolen, the newspaper said.




A group of tourists also disappeared in the area, and the expedition will look for them as well as the abominable snowman, the newspaper reported. It did not say when the expedition would begin.






# Seoul doubts, yet hopes meeting will produce talks soon

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — South Korean government sources have doubts and hopes that Friday's meeting with North Korean representatives — the first in three years — will lead to parliamentary talks within 10 days.

The session at the truce village of Panmunjom will bring together five legislators from each side to try to clear the way for talks on easing tensions and sharing the Olympics. It will be the first meeting between the two sides since Sept. 25, 1985.

Despite differences on the expected agenda for the parliamentary session, South Korean government sources said

they hope these negotiations can begin about Aug. 28 at Pyongyang, the capital of North Korea.

Park Joon-kyu, the chief South Korean delegate, said Thursday that his group will do its best to persuade North Korea to send athletes to the upcoming Olympics in Seoul.

The government party lawmaker urged the Pyongyang authorities to change their obstinate and hostile attitudes and said he hoped Friday's meeting will lead to durable peace on the divided peninsula.

"I think North Korea would agree to main talks before the Olympics, as it

cannot stay out of the current trend of reform in the Soviet Union and East European countries," Park said.

The main dispute over the agenda for the talks stems from North Korean demands that the two parliaments discuss only two topics — a non-aggression pact and Pyongyang's bid to be a co-host of the Olympics.

North Korea has said it would boycott the Sept. 17-Oct. 2 Olympics unless it is made a co-host of the Games. International Olympic officials rejected the demand, saying the Olympics are awarded to a single city.

Government officials believe North Korea wants to take up the non-aggression pact to set the stage for the withdrawal of 41,000 U.S. troops stationed in South Korea under a mutual defense pact.

North Korea also insists representatives of all walks of life attend the proposed parliamentary conference.

Parliamentary sources said Seoul wants to limit the size and expand the agenda to include economic and personnel exchanges, the resumption of other suspended dialogue and a summit between the presidents of the Koreas.

"I don't think North Korea would stick

to its proposal and endanger the talks," said Park Kwan-yong, a South Korean opposition delegate.

In the last parliamentary talks between the two sides, North Korea agreed to limit the number of delegates and take up all issues raised by either side, he noted.

Parliamentary talks were one of three channels of dialogue opened at that time. Legislators met twice before North Korea suspended all contact, including Red Cross and economic talks, in 1986 to protest regular military exercises between South Korea and the United States.

## Hostages' release not likely

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Pro-Iranian kidnappers who hold at least two Americans said Thursday the hostages won't be freed soon and compared predictions of their release to a desert mirage.

There has been speculation some or all of the 18 foreign hostages, who include nine Americans, would be released now that Iran has accepted a cease-fire in its 8-year-old war with Iraq.

Thursday's declaration was in a statement from Islamic Jihad, or Islamic Holy War, delivered to the Beirut office of a Western news agency with a photograph of captive journalist Terry A. Anderson.

After the increasing talk about the early release of the foreign hostages, we announce today the following: What everyone expects soon is a mirage assumed to be water by a thirsty man," it said.

Anderson, 40, was chief Middle East correspondent of The Associated Press when he was abducted March 16, 1985, in a Moslem west Beirut while returning home from a Saturday morning tennis game. He has been held longest of the foreign hostages.

The photo showed him from the chest up, with a bushy beard and untrimmed moustache, clad in a sweatshirt and looking straight at the camera and not wearing his eyeglasses.

It was unlike any of the nine previous pictures of Anderson provided by his captors and appeared by his captors and appeared by his captors and appeared by his captors.

Islamic Jihad has admitted holding Anderson and Thomas Sutherland, a 56-year-old American citizen born in Scotland, Sutherland, of Fort Collins, Colo., was acting dean of agriculture at the Associated University of Beirut when he was seized June 9, 1985.

An accompanying photograph is Islamic Jihad's way of authenticating its statements, which are typewritten in Arabic.

Police stop bank robbers in shootout

BONN, West Germany (AP) — Police set off flash grenades and opened fire on a crowd of highway Thursday to stop two bank robbers who took more than 30 hostages in two days of gun battles and interactional chases that left three people dead.

A woman hostage was killed in the final shootout that also seriously wounded the gunman and a second woman hostage and slightly injured a female accomplice. A 35-year-old hostage and a policeman were killed Wednesday, one day after the bandits robbed a bank in a small northwestern town and commandeered a bus carrying 30 passengers.

At least three other people were injured in the two-day ordeal in which the pistol-wielding bandits met with pursuing journalists several times, letting reporters inside the captive bus as Bremen and holding a road-side news conference in Cologne.

The bandits, Hans-Jürgen Roesner, 31, and Dieter Degowski, 32, had traded the bus and all but two hostages for a BMW sedan after they crossed over into the Netherlands.

Officers stopped the sedan on a crowded autobahn at 1:45 p.m. by setting off exploding devices that emit a powerful flash of light, said a police spokesman, Horst Fechner.

## Mourning Moslems rampage through India border towns

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — Moslems mourning the death of Pakistan's president rampaged through three Indian border towns Thursday and security forces shot and killed four of them, news reports said.

About 100 other demonstrators who defied a curfew in Srinagar were injured in clashes as they tried to burn Hindu homes, shops and temples, the reports said. At least seven people were admitted to hospitals after being shot.

Army troops also were deployed to quell arson and looting in two nearby towns. Police and paramilitary forces were placed on alert in other areas along the 970-mile border, officials said.

India and Pakistan have fought three wars since both gained independence from Britain in 1947. Pakistan claims Jammu and Kashmir as part of its territory although the state was granted to India when the subcontinent was partitioned.

## Water rights filings lag well behind projections

TWIN FALLS — Water rights filings in Lincoln, Adams and Clark counties are substantially below projections for the Snake River Adjudication, says the state Department of Water Resources.

About one quarter of the expected filings came in, says David Shaw, Water Resources adjudication bureau chief. The deadline passed in those counties.

In Lincoln County the state projected 3,000 filings. The actual number was 728.

Some 3,200 Clark County filings were expected, but only 203 received in Adams County, excluding the Weiser River drainage, the state got 543 filings

when it expected 2,000.

Both water resources and 5th District Judge Daniel Hurlbutt Jr. are reemphasizing ways to tell people about the need to file for their water rights.

An adjudication is a court-ordered determination of water rights in the basin. If people don't file, they will lose their rights, says Hurlbutt who is presiding over the case.

"We have no intention of seeing people lose their water rights as a result of the adjudication," he says.

But Hurlbutt says there is no way to compel people to file with Water Resources. Claims can be taken in Twin Falls or Water Resources offices, 214 N. 4th Ave. E.

The filing deadline in Twin Falls County is Dec. 22 and the Gooding County deadline is Sept. 1.

Water Resources is hiring a consultant to survey Lincoln, Clark and Idaho county residents, Shaw says. "The aim is to find out whether residents were aware of the need for filing and whether they did so."

The survey will be done in a couple of weeks, Shaw said, he didn't know the cost yet.

"The shortfall is so consistent, it makes me believe the projects may have been in error," says Shaw.

The projections are based on previously recorded rights and records from the unrecorded rights and records from the unnecessary hassle.

But Swan and the Sorensons were among those filing anyway.

The city of Shoshone filed for its water

under Hurlbutt is the first determination of water rights in the basin.

Shaw says the state may need to change the way it informs people about the adjudication.

So far, the state need legal ads in newspapers, news releases to the media, mailings to water rights holders, and briefings of state and local officials. In some cases the state bought radio time to describe the adjudication.

Some Magic Valley residents such as Bill Swan, a rancher, and the Glen Sorenson family, who farms in Dietrich, see the adjudication as an expensive and unnecessary hassle.

The process was more complex than city officials first realized, says Jerry Baltazar, president of the Shoshone City Council.

"The attorneys had to be involved," he said.

Fred Brossy says he had no problem filing on his Lincoln County farmland, including a half dozen domestic and stock wells.

"The silly thing about this is all the water rights except 'the irrigation well rights were adjudicated a long time ago. It's (the adjudication) sort of like an extra. I guess you have got to do the whole thing," he says.

The state estimates there will be some 185,000 water rights filings in the 10

## Watkins says press treats him unfairly

IDAHO FALLS — Republican congressional candidate Dane Watkins says the Idaho press is "refusing to deal even-handedly" with him in his race.

In a fund-raising letter dated Aug. 12, Watkins wrote that the press, particularly "big city, daily newspapers" have not printed his side of the story in his campaign against Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho.

"If Mr. Stallings burps it's printed, but when I try to speak to the serious issues facing us, they ignore it or worse yet, use my comments as an excuse for a pro-Stallings headline," Watkins wrote.

As an example, Watkins said he tried to have the Post-Register publish a guest opinion on Stallings' role in the Swan Falls water rights agreement, which sets a minimum streamflow on the Snake River and allows development on the Snake River Plains.

"I was told it was against policy," Watkins wrote. "Yet a few days later, a guest opinion on the same issue from former governor and defeated Senate candidate John Evans shows up. Apparently, they changed their policies!"

Watkins said Attorney General Jim Jones authorized a guest opinion about Stallings as a response to Evans, "and they refused to run that too."

William Hathaway, Post-Register managing editor said the article Watkins said The Post-Register refused to publish appeared in its editions of July 17.

"We think Mr. Watkins owes us a retraction, Hathaway said.

Moreover, Mr. Watkins claims that our news coverage is slanted has little to do with the opinion articles published on our editorial page," he said. "The Post-Register has covered the 2nd District

## Supporters of Milner project hold sway at FERC meeting

TWIN FALLS — Farmers and other supporters of the Milner Dam hydroelectric project dominated an afternoon meeting Thursday with staff of the federal dam licensing agency.

Speakers opposed a staff report calling for a minimum stream flow at Milner to benefit fish and wildlife. They called minimum flows legally impossible and a taking of water desperately needed for irrigation.

"The Diel of the North Side Canal Co. said if the shareholders saw their water being given away, 'the directors would be railroaded out of town and I'd be hung from the nearest tree.' North Side is one of the Milner developers."

But the Twin Falls Canal Co., the other Milner developer, says it would support a 58 cubic feet per second flow during irrigation season and a 150 cfs flow during nonirrigation periods.

Federal Energy Regulatory Commission staff are in Twin Falls to take additional information about three proposed hydroelectric projects on the Snake River, including Milner. FERC staff is also looking at new information on Idaho Power Co.'s planned Twin Falls power plant expansion.

About 50 people, mainly canal company officials and shareholders, attended the afternoon meeting at the Holiday Inn on Blue Lakes Boulevard. The meeting resumed in the evening.

At peak operation Milner could generate 48.5 megawatts at any moment. A typical Idaho Power Co. residential customer uses about one megawatt hour per month.

The other projects are at Star Falls with a 37 megawatt capacity and Auger Falls, generating 43.6 megawatts at capacity. The Twin Falls expansion would raise total capacity to 61 megawatts. The Milner, Twin Falls and Star Falls projects will cost more than \$100 million.

In November 1987 FERC issued a draft environmental impact statement on the projects that said only the Auger Falls project was feasible.

New information provided by the project applicants prompted FERC staff to come to Twin Falls to prepare a supplement to the draft envi-

ronmental statement. The Twin Falls and North Side canal companies also sent a delegation to FERC staff in Washington to protest the draft statement.

"For FERC to try and establish a minimum flow from a licensed flow would be nothing less than a taking of property rights," said Rulon Chandler, a Wendell farmer on the North Side Canal system.

The North Side and Twin Falls canal companies are seeking a hydro license at Milner to obtain revenues from electricity sales. The money would be used to pay for \$7 to \$12-million in repairs the state says are needed at the dam.

Without the revenues, North Side Canal Co. customers would be charged \$4 more per acre. They now pay \$12 per acre. The \$4 charge would be assessed for 40 years to cover part of the repair costs, says North Side Canal's Vince Albert.

Chandler, the Wendell farmer, said any additional cost is too much.

Farmers are concerned about three things, said Robert Hackworth, North Side water master. He named the repair of Milner, the protection of water rights and the cost of water.

"Nobody was shocked worse than I was when I saw your first environmental statement," said Diel, North Side Canal manager.

Initially, FERC wanted the hydro turbine in the dam instead of 1.6 miles downstream in the canal companies wanted. FERC also called for a 15,000 cfs flow on weekends to benefit kayakers who use that stretch of the river.

Diel said FERC's recommendations were physically and legally impossible. FERC staff has since changed some of its recommendations and is considering the downstream turbine idea again.

Several speakers observed that the state water plan sets a 0 cfs minimum flow at Milner. Diel said even a 58 cfs minimum flow at Milner makes him angry. That amount is what leaks from the dam during irrigation season.

With 58 cfs North Side could make deliveries at the end of the irrigation season. He said in

## Idaho attorney general's office disciplines school of modeling

TWIN FALLS — The Idaho attorney general's office has ordered the owner of a Twin Falls modeling school to register her business, revise contracts and promotional materials, and establish a refund policy on out-of-state trips.

In a letter last week to Bonnie Metcalf, owner of The Model Image, Catherine King, deputy attorney general for the Business Regulation Division, said she will close the file on her two-month inquiry due these three issues are addressed.

Meanwhile, Metcalf has closed

her Twin Falls modeling school in the Campus Commons Center, 677-C Filer Ave. West. She has opened a new school, Metcalf Modeling in Boise.

King asked Metcalf to alter existing contracts which state her school is "Licensed and Operated Under All Laws of the State of Idaho."

She also ordered Metcalf to register her modeling school with the Idaho Department of Education, citing a state law requiring registration of proprietary schools. King did not find Metcalf in violation for failing to register previously, however.

In a more conciliatory tone King asked Metcalf to put refund

policies in writing regarding Metcalf-sponsored trips to an annual New York City modeling convention.

King also suggested Metcalf might avoid future misunderstandings by providing potential students with promotional literature outlining her curriculum and including the number of graduates who have been placed with other modeling agencies or are working in the modeling industry.

King has asked to review those materials.

"She needs to define what she means by placement," King said in an interview. "If you can't back

## Victim testifies during rape trial

GOODING — The victim of an alleged rape testified Thursday she didn't want to go home yet so she agreed to go to an after-hours party with two men she had never met.

"They didn't make it to the party. The two men seized her two friends out of a car on the way to the party, she said, and then threatened to kill her if she didn't have sex with them."

Gooding County Prosecutor Lynn Nelson has charged Jose Gomez, 20, with the rape of the 26-year-old woman. Nelson also has charged Gomez with aggravated assault and infamous crime against nature for forcing

the victim to have oral sex with him.

Gomez' friend, Antonio Segura Hinojosa, 22, was convicted by a jury on July 21 of rape and infamous crime against nature.

The rape trial, moving at a glacial pace, was in its fourth day when the victim testified Thursday. She spent seven hours on the stand, mostly under cross examination, explaining the intricate details of the March 1 incident.

Nelson neared the end of his case Thursday. The jury was selected Monday, and three of his seven witnesses spent close to a full day on the stand under lengthy cross examinations.

Twin Falls attorney Golden Bennett represents Gomez. He's indicated he will argue that the

victim volunteered to have sex after she and two of her friends tried to rob Gomez and Hinojosa.

Bennett has been cross-examining witnesses on each detail of their stories and more than once on some details.

In addition, the court has provided an interpreter for Gomez, who doesn't speak fluent English. The necessity of interpreting each question and answer before proceeding has more than doubled trial time.

Nelson's witnesses say the incident started in the Northern Tavern, a bar in Jerome. Gomez and his friend Hinojosa, asked the victim if she wanted to go to a party in Wendell, the victim said.

It was nearly 1 a.m., and the bar was about to close. The vic-

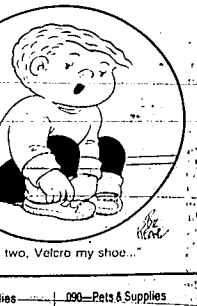

## Nitty Gritty Dirt Band plays on

**JACKPOT** "I need a job for these two hands, I'm a workin' man with nowhere to go."

These are words from a recent hit song by the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, a working band that has been touring and recording for 23 years.

But these rockers do have somewhere to go. The group has been given a job at Caetano Pete's in Jackpot, Nev., and will perform tonight at 8 and 11 p.m. Tickets are \$25, \$20 and \$15 for various seats at each show and they are almost sold out.

"We like to see that the audience has a good time. That's our big premise," says drummer Jimmie Fadden in a recent telephone interview. "People work hard for their money, and they deserve their money's worth. We like to see them smiling and happy when they leave."

Fadden says "Nitty Gritty" means the basics, the bottom-line, back to square one and simple. "Dirt-Band," he explains, means down to earth, but not a bluegrass, rock or jug band.

The whole title, he says, is just sort of a colorful description for an all-American band that plays traditional music in modern style.

"I think we rock a little harder than most," Fadden says. "It would be within the same vein that Charlie Daniels is modern. It's Middle America, the eight scenes and smells thereof, the lifestyle."

In the mid-1960s, the Dirt Band formed in the midst of California's folk-rock era. Playing washboards and megaphones, wearing long hair, pin-striped suits and cowboy hats, the six-man band — then including Jackson Browne — began its long and ever-changing career.

Influencing these young singers were the likes of Jimmie Rodgers, Woody Guthrie, Pete Seeger, The Carter Family, Earl Scruggs, Muddy Waters and Lightning Hopkins.

"Real eclectic stuff," says Fadden. "You could include Buddy Holly in there, too."

In 1977, with shorter hair and an accordion replacing the washboard, the Dirt Band was selected by the Soviet government as the first American country-western group to tour the USSR. After 25 concerts and three television shows, the band was a tourist attraction, Fadden recalls.

Average Russian citizens are curious about Americans, he says, and they have about the same basic wants, including a nice place to live, a job and a vacation every year.

"I know that they have been spoon-fed a lot of the propaganda, not unlike us," Fadden says. "I mean, during a lot of things we were taught in school — our age-group in particular — about Russia that wasn't true."

In 1986, the Dirt Band sang for EarthAid to help a few farmers through financially hard times.

"There's a lot of farmers going under because of the drought," says Fadden. "I hate to see people lose their family property that they've kept for four or five generations."

Fadden and guitarist Jeff Hanna are the only two original members of the Dirt Band. Mandolin, bass and guitar player Jimmy Ibbotson joined in 1968, and keyboard man Bob Carpenter added his talent in 1978. Over the years, more than a dozen others have claimed membership to the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band.

Fadden says some left to pursue solo careers and others said goodbye because the travel schedule was "pretty tough at the time."

## Musicians gather for 11th annual festival

**HAILEY** — The 11th Annual Northern Rockies Folk Festival returns to the Wood River valley tonight and tomorrow to present a combination of bluegrass, country and ragtime music.

Eddie Clearwater, Bob Brozman, the Good-ol' Persons and Tom Ball and Kenny Sultan are among the many musicians the Sun Valley Center for the Arts and Humanities has brought in for this year's festival.

All concerts will be held at the Hatley City Park. A \$3 Booster Button purchased at the park, or the Sun Valley Center Gallery, gives adults admission to both days of music. There is no charge for children under 12 or senior citizens.

Over the past 10 years the folk festival has been supported solely by fundraising efforts. However, it was the decision of the Sun Valley Center's board of directors to charge a nominal admission fee to help curb the cost of the \$55,000 festival, said festival director Kit Nerass.

The music begins tonight at 5:30 p.m. and will feature traditional Northern Rockies music all evening. Joye Vetter, the Nevada-born singer/songwriter, starts off the

evening with songs from her latest album, "Walkin' on the Sunny Side."

At 6:30 p.m. county and western classics will be heard from The Great Western Orchestra. The group features lead singer Cindy Church, guitar player Nathan Brinkman, and the "Mardi-land Kid," Dave Wilkie. The group played with Ian Tyson during the 1985 festival.

At 8 p.m., Friday night's headliner, The Good Ol' Persons, takes to the stage. Billed as one of the best bluegrass bands in the nation, the group is comprised of lead singer Kathy Kallick, Beth Rabe on bass, John Reischman on mandolin, Sally Van Meter playing the banjo and dobro, and California State Fiddle Champ Paul Shelasky on guitar and fiddle.

The first five groups to perform Saturday represent the best of the area's regional folk artists, Nerass said.

A musical program for children begins at 1 p.m. Saturday followed at 2:30 p.m. by local veteran folk music writers/singers Sher Brodowski and Jan Grey.

At 3 p.m. Dave Sealander, dubbed "The King of the Stomach Steinway," will perform. From New Sweden, Idaho, Sealander is one of the great traditional Idaho artists and every year comes up with fine guest musicians to

back up his performance.

At 3:30 p.m., singer/guitarist Jon Sirkis will perform a collective work of folk music. Sirkis is the producer/director of the popular Boulder, Colorado Folk Festival. His latest album is "A New Loss, Colors." Sirkis has played many of the major North American folk festivals.

Following at 4:30 p.m. is the Hailey host band, The Boulder Brothers. This five-piece group of local musicians has recorded on Sheep Eater Records.

Beginning at 5:30 p.m. the festival takes a look at its urban roots with a performance by Bob Brozman. Brozman plays only electric guitar and raps on the slide guitar. Switching among his antique-nickel-plated National guitars, mandolin and ukulele, Brozman unleashes a set of hard-driving rhythms intermingled with his sometimes zany, sometimes sardonic humor.

At 6:30 p.m., the dynamic traditional blues artists, Tom Ball and Kenny Sultan, take the spotlight. Ball and Sultan have been fixtures at blues and bluegrass festivals around the country, and are planning a European tour as well.

The Saturday night headliner and final concert of the festival begins at 8 p.m. Chicago's flamboyant blues

## Gallery displays Idaho works

**TWIN FALLS** — Think of a watercolor painting. You probably picture a serene landscape with pastel dabs and wisps of cool blue or green.

At least that's how many people envision a watercolor, says Maria Larson, a Twin Falls gallery owner.

But an exhibiting watercolor painter by Idaho artists currently on display at the downtown Larson Arts Gallery, proves the medium can be stretched far beyond lovely landscapes.

A gaggle of turkeys and an abstract work in deep purple and fuchsia accompany the 25 paintings included in a statewide traveling show, sponsored by the Idaho Watercolor Society.

There are landscapes and flowers, too, as the show consists of selected works from the Society's sixth annual juried exhibition held earlier this summer in Boise. The paintings will remain at the Larson Gallery in Twin Falls until Sept. 2.

Roy Mason, of Wendell, is the only Magic Valley artist showcased this year. His watercolor, "Mountain Stream," won fourth place in the juried exhibit, marking the third consecutive year Mason has won an award.

Many of the paintings are for sale, with prices ranging from \$220 to \$1,700. But looking is free. The Larson Gallery is open weekdays from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m. and Saturdays from 10 a.m. until 5:30 p.m.

## Religious films no longer tempt audiences

**HOLLYWOOD** — Biblical film epics were once a staple of Hollywood's success formula, but in recent years they haven't had a prayer at the box office.

So judging from the phenomenal start of "The Last Temptation of Christ," the controversy surrounding the film looks like manna from heaven for Universal Pictures.

Straightforward religious films, like Westerns, are failing to attract the viewers they did in the days of Cecil B. DeMille's "The Ten Commandments," William Wyler's "Ben Hur" and George Stevens' "The Greatest Story Ever Told." They garnered

huge audiences in the 1950s and early 60s.

In 1985, "King David," a big-budget saga starring Richard Gere, bombed. Two years later, "The Mission," featuring Robert DeNiro and themes strongly endorsed by Christian leaders, also flopped.

But director Martin Scorsese's "Last Temptation" denounced as blasphemous by some Christian leaders, opened to packed houses last weekend. It played in seven U.S. cities and two in Canada, taking in \$4,579 per screen for a three-day total of \$401,211, a jubilant Universal Pictures reported.

"I think if 'The Mission' came out 10-12 years ago, it would have received a larger, general

audience," said Tim Penland, president of Penland Productions, specializing in the marketing of Christian films. "Had the film not been perceived as a religious epic, it could have done better business."

Part of the problem, Penland said, is that today's moviegoers tend to avoid films that have overt religious messages.

Another sign of the times, Evangelist Billy Graham is quietly retrenching from his effort to use film as a tool for spreading a spiritual message.

Even as "Last Temptation" is

drawing big crowds to see a story about a Jesus plagued by human doubt, Graham is shutting down the Burbank studios of his religious film production company, considered the world's largest.

"Our (movie) attendance has not been what Hollywood would consider to be large," said Paul Kurtz, director of distribution and operations for Graham's Worldwide Pictures Inc.

Worldwide's Burbank production studio was shut in May, a move brought on by tight finances. More than a dozen employees were laid off, Kurtz said. Only one employee remains in the offices.

Kurtz added that some of the studio's duties will be assumed at Graham headquarters in Min-

neapolis. The Burbank production site will soon be put up for sale and no plans for another Worldwide feature film are in the offing.

Worldwide, instead, will devote its filmmaking energies to low-budget films for showings in churches, prisons and nursing homes, Kurtz said.

Started in the 1950s, Worldwide was envisioned by Graham as a modern proselytizing tool. "The idea sometimes worked. The Hiding Place," a 1975 inspirational movie on Dutch Christians sheltering Jews in World War II, did respectable business and received satisfactory reviews.

But "Caught," a 1987 World-

# 'A Fish Called Wanda' proves joint effort

Almost from the start, 'A Fish Called Wanda' was the joint creation of Monty Python's John Cleese and Michael Palin and their American 'friends,' Kevin Kline and Jamie Lee Curtis. Palin, whose father stammered, provided a valuable resource in making stuttering funny in his playing of Ken Pike, owner of a beloved fish named Wanda. The exceptionally nasty, larger-than-life Otto West was conceived for the flamboyant and virtuosic theater star Kline, whose film roles often have been more low-key. Curtis, who plays the sexually manipulative Wanda Gershwitz, came into the picture on the strength of her acting in 'Trading Places,' which won her an English Academy Award for best supporting actress. All three worked with Cleese on the film's dialogue and the development of their characters. Curtis even helped out on the direction of the love scenes.

One key to film's concept comedy, is the main man behind 'A Fish Called Wanda.' He wrote the script, served as an executive producer with Steve Abbott and plays the central character. Originally he was listed as co-director with Charles Crichton, who also devised the story with Cleese. But Cleese says that was just ruse to allow Crichton, a grand old man of the English cinema whose best-known film is the legendary 'The Lavender Hill Mob,' to direct his first major feature in 20 years.

In real life, Cleese comes across not as the sort of fussy, ridiculous chap he often plays but as an amiable, relaxed, highly entertaining regular guy, though a bit taller than most. For a recent press party in New York city to promote 'Wanda,' his rangy frame was turned out in casual Anglo-American style, slightly faded jeans, blue and white rugby shirt and white sneakers.

Talking about the genesis of 'A Fish Called Wanda,' he says, 'Things always change. I can't

remember the original intention.' One requirement asserted itself early on, however: The new Cleese film could not be too English, as was his 'Clockwise,' a comedy about an ambitious, twit-y headmaster that failed to attract a U.S. audience. 'The experience of 'Clockwise' made me very determined if I was going to spend five years on and off on it, I didn't want it suffering the fate of 'Clockwise' and not opening in Chicago,' Cleese says. 'It wasn't a bad movie,' he says ruefully of 'Clockwise,' 'but it was so English.'

One way to avoid total Englishness would be to mix Americans in with the Brits. And, Cleese says, 'by-the-time-the-'Clockwise'-experience had happened, I had already made up my mind that Kevin should be in it, for two reasons. One is that we got on extraordinarily well. The other, I just enjoy him so much as an actor.' The friendship and mutual admiration goes back to Kline's first film, Cleese says, 'ever since having dinner—in Sydney—when we were both doing publicity in Australia, the week after I'd seen him in 'Sophie's Choice.' I just thought this guy is great. I want to work with somebody like this.'

'So Kevin was always in it, and Michael Palin was in it from an even earlier stage, just because I think he's the funniest guy, and also his dad had a stutter. I knew one of the characters was going to have a stutter, and it's not easy to make a stutterer funny, unless you've really observed it.'

Curtis, who plays a seductive young woman who comes on to Archie and eventually falls for him, was the last to join the team.

'I remember a stage when I was looking at a couple of English actresses for Wanda, long time ago, probably four years back, just out of curiosity without telling them I was looking,' Cleese says. 'And then I think it was something to do with seeing 'Trading Places' and thinking,

'Who is this girl?' Because in England, she's only known from 'Trading Places,' and when I cast her, no one in England was the slightest bit surprised. Whereas in America, people think of her as being the horror queen.'

As 'A Fish Called Wanda' took shape, the idea of four main characters emerged. 'Oddly enough,' Cleese says, 'I think I chose the number four, because I loved 'Beyond the Fringe' more than any other show I'd ever seen, and I always wanted to write something for four really funny characters and reproduce that spirit—of Peter Cook going off and Dudley Moore coming on, and Dudley going off—and Jonathan Miller coming on. That extraordinary richness that you get.' (The fourth member of the company was Alan Bennett, today a successful sitcom comic playwright whose plays are always too English to come to America.)

'I was drawn to four characters, and then the fact that they should be split two and two seemed to me perfect. Plus, the other element, which is the fact that having been in 'He breaks off and explains his American connections: 'First of all I was married to Connie Booth, who is American. Now I'm married to Barbara Trentalham, who's American.'

But the idea for the naughty caper sex farce began with Cleese, the tallest and most twitish of the legendary Python troupe. For years, Cleese says, he toyed with the idea of making a film about the love-hate relationship between Americans and their British cousins. 'Cleese knows Americans up close, as he lives here with his second American wife.'

And gradually his film evolved into the story of two Americans, played by Kline and Curtis, who execute a big jewel heist with two Englishmen, played by the low-key Palin and the intense Tom Georgeson. The latter plays a rather repellent character named George, who is grabbed by Scotland Yard almost immediately after the heist but alone knows where the jewels are hidden. Cleese cast himself as George's barrister, a mild-mannered, sexually innocent wit named Archie Leech.

Cleese, whose 'Fawlty Towers' is considered one of the highest achievements in recent television

# 'Rolling Stone' compiles Top 100

NEW YORK (AP) — Rolling Stone magazine, long the definitive word on rock 'n' roll, has chosen the 100 best singles of the past quarter-century, and the magazine's name is high on the list.

"I Can't Get No Satisfaction" by the Rolling Stones topped the list, followed by Bob Dylan's "Like a Rolling Stone." The Beatles were third with "I Wanna Hold Your Hand" and its flip-side, "I Saw Her Standing There."

The Rolling Stones hit the list three more times: at No. 27 with "Honky Tonk Women"; at No. 68 with "Jumpin' Jack Flash"; and at No. 74 with "Brown Sugar."

"I actually didn't want it to be

a single," said Keith Richards, who invented the buzzing guitar riff for "Satisfaction." He told Rolling Stone: "I thought it was just filler."

Richards said he wrote the guitar line in a motel in Clearwater, Fla., during the band's U.S. tour in 1965.

"Like a Rolling Stone" is Dylan's only recording in the top 100, though his "All Along the Watchtower" ranked 61st in the version recorded by Jimi Hendrix and "Mr. Tambourine Man," covered by The Byrds, was No. 86.

"Like a Rolling Stone" broke through the three-minute format of most 45s and set the rock world on the road to free-form

FM. Unlike Richards, Dylan never suffered doubts about the quality of his song. "The first two lines which rhymed 'kiddin' you will 'didn't you' just about knocked me out, and later on, when I got to the jugglers and the chrome horse and the princess on the steeple, it all just about got to me too much," he said in a statement given to the magazine.

The Beatles also appear at No. 29 with "Hey Jude," No. 48 with "Strawberry Fields Forever" backed by "Penny Lane"; and at No. 53 with "Help!" John Lennon's "Imagine" is No. 44 and his "Instant Karma" is No. 79.

The magazine, which celebrated its 20th anniversary last year, said it could easily have compiled a list of 100 great 45 rpm recordings from the 1950s. However, it chose to go back to 1963 as a time of revitalization and reinvention in rock 'n' roll.

The highest-rated song from 1963 is "Louie Louie," the unintelligible garage-rock hit by the Kingsmen of Portland, Ore. Other 1963 hits are "Da Doo Ron Ron" by the Crystals (No. 35) and "Be My Baby" by the Ronettes (No. 38), both produced by Phil Spector.

Rolling Stone's list was compiled by 25 rock critics and is in the Sept. 8 edition, which goes on sale Tuesday.

The 25 rock critics, including Rolling Stone editor and publisher Jann Wenner, paid little homage to the King of rock 'n' roll, Elvis Presley, putting his "Suspicious Minds" at No. 37.

Of course, Presley's best recordings were mostly before 1963. So were Chuck Berry's, whose later singles didn't make the list.

There's more soft rock than hard rock — hard rock always has done better with fans than critics. Aerosmith's "Walk This Way" is No. 61, and Led Zepplin's "Whole Lotta Love" is No. 96.

The soft rock is mostly by groups, not individuals, and most of the groups no longer exist: the Eagles, the Mamas and the Papables, Buffalo Springfield, Fleetwood Mac, Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young, the Byrds and Lovin' Spoonful.

Among those missing from the list are The Band, the Carpenters, Linda Ronstadt, Joni Mitchell, Jim Croce, Boz Scaggs, Gordon Lightfoot, the Monkees, Kris Kristofferson, Cat Stevens, Madonna, Carly Simon, the Donnie Brothers and Cher, with or without Sonny.

Paul Simon, who was in 71st place with the Simon and Garfunkel hit "Bridge Over Troubled Water," didn't place as a solo artist. Neither did Tina Turner, who was No. 30 with ex-husband Ike Turner with "Riva" Deep Mountain High.

# BSU archive keeps Idaho writers alive

BOISE — Idaho writers — established writers as well as struggling authors — will have their works preserved and cataloged under a new project sponsored by BSU's Hemingway Western Studies Center.

The Idaho Writers' Archive will compile a data base of Idaho writers and collect and catalog books, magazines, manuscripts and other works by these authors. The works will be cataloged and stored in the BSU Library and will be available to literary scholars.

The program's coordinator, English professor Charles Guilford, says the approaching Idaho Centennial underscores the role that literature has played in shaping the state's sense of identity.

"We believe that an Idaho Writers' Archive is a suitable way of

consolidating this heritage as we move forward into our next century," he says. Guilford says because writers frequently work in obscurity during their lifetimes only to be recognized after their deaths, much of their work is lost. The archive, he says, will attempt to keep track of current writers and collect as much writing-related material as possible from past authors.

## Music videos slipping

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Music videos have become one of the sharpest promotional tools for records since radio play, but their usefulness may be waning.

Not all artists need, or want, their MTV, and record company executives concede that after years of trying, they simply cannot make money selling video clips to consumers.

While costs have increased, outlets for showing music videos have diminished from several syndicated shows to just two continuous programming cable channels and six major cable shows lasting from 14 hours a day to one hour a week.

Still, such stars as Tiffany, Terence Trent D'Arby and George

Michael owe their success to the image they present through slick video productions that cost anywhere from \$10,000 to \$225,000 to produce.

"When videos first started, it was an emotional point for everyone to ask for one, and it made sense," said Jeff Gold, vice president of creative services for A&M Records. "I can remember five years ago that \$100,000 was an unthinkable amount, and now \$100,000 is a regular cost for a major production."

"Three years ago, I said there was no market for music videos in retail stores. That holds true today. We don't even stock it — it just isn't worth it to us," said Alan Caplan, video guru.

## Local artist presents winning poster design

KETCHUM — The Ketchum Wagon Days Committee announced that local artist Ralph Harris has produced the winning poster design for this year's Wagon Days celebration, scheduled for Labor Day weekend.

Harris' oil painting was chosen from eight submissions. The painting depicts the Ketchum Post-Freight Line established by Horace C. Lewis in 1884. Each of Lewis' freight lines consisted of five wagons drawn by 14-20 horses and mules.

The wagons in Harris' painting are balanced on the Trail Creek Road with the Trail Creek drainage in the background. Harris was born in Hanley with a family history that dates to 1884 in the Wood River Valley. As a close friend of Kate Lewis, the widow of Horace C. Lewis, Harris says he has been fascinated by the history of the Ketchum Post

Freight Line. He has been an illustrator for 21 years and has worked for Ski Magazine and the U.S. Air Force. He has produced six stamp designs for the Fish and Game Department.

Wendy Jaquet, Wagon Days Coordinator, indicated that the committee was pleased to receive a submission from such a talented artist. "Normally we do not budget for a four-color poster, but we made the exception this year because Ralph's painting is such a strong statement about the theme and event. We believe that poster sales will be brisk with Ralph's design," she said.

The poster will retail for \$5 and is available at the Chamber of Commerce as well as from Wood River Valley retailers. Harris will receive a \$100 honorarium for his submission. The committee hopes to exhibit the painting over the Wagon Days weekend.

## BSU gets Hemingway books

BOISE — Ernest Hemingway is a more familiar face in the Boise State University Library these days.

That is because Florida playwright John de Groot has donated the 140-book collection he used to research the life of the famous author — the "one-man show," which began its national tour at Boise State in May.

The de Groot collection contains every biography written about Hemingway as well as books by his wives and friends. Several titles are now out of print, and others are first editions or signed by the authors. The collection also includes copies of the FBI files on Hemingway, tapes of personal interviews conducted by de Groot, and directors' scripts of movies made from Hemingway novels.

De Groot gathered the books during the five years he worked on the script for "Papa," which they give BSU one of the best research collections in the country, de Groot said.

Students and other researchers will be able to use the collection in the library but the books cannot be checked out.

The books are the first donation to the Idaho Writers' Archive, which was started by BSU to preserve the works of writers who have lived in Idaho.

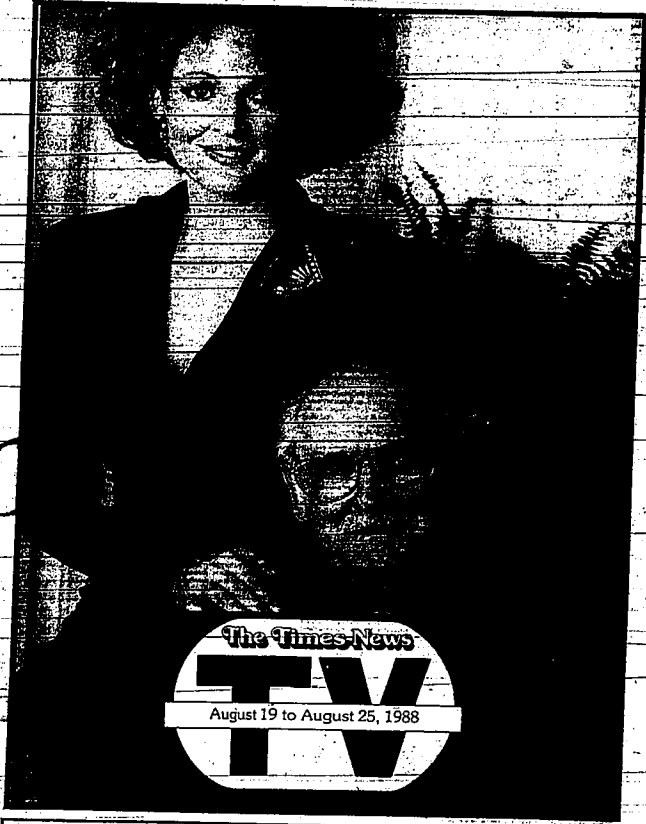

# 'The Cavanaugh's' gets 2nd chance as summer replacement series

One of the brightest spots on the CBS schedule a year ago last spring was the mid-season replacement "The Cavanaugh's," which starred Barnard Hughes as a crusty patriarch and Christine Ebersole as his daughter. It focused on their feisty, extended-Irish-Catholic family, who all lived in the same house in Boston. It brought in critical praise and a following of sorts — then it disappeared.

"The show never really died. It just went away," says Ebersole, who plays Kit, the sassy but loving ex-show girl who has returned home to help raise her niece and nephews. "We had great reviews and great numbers. We finished higher than 'Designing Women' for the year. So no one understood why we didn't make it back on the air."

CBS still had enough belief in the show, however, to shoot eight new episodes, which never found their way onto the spring schedule. But now, with the writers' strike cleaning the network cupboards bare, a home has been found for it as a late-summer replacement.

"We kept hearing through the grapevine that they were saving us

for something special," Ebersole says. "Thank God we weren't part of the Tuesday-night debacle (a CBS comedy block of shows last spring that flopped disastrously). So I guess this is it. Now they're telling us we'll be doing another five."

Not much has changed since the original 13 episodes. "There's nothing major, like a husband for me or anything," says Ebersole. "It's more the case of what happens when people get to know each other. All the good things are still there. These are people who aren't afraid to talk about sex and religion and other taboos. They're very honest. Even though I'm not Irish-Catholic, I grew up with it around me, and I really liked Kit. I loved the fact that she was in show business."

Ebersole herself has spent many years in show business. She appeared opposite Richard Burton in "Camelot" and spent a year on "Saturday Night Live." "I don't think I'd do anything quite like that again," she says. "I'd do something less political, like 'The Carol Burnett Show.'" She broke into prime-time TV with a role on "Valerie" (now "The Hogan Family").

"I came to TV out of necessity," Ebersole explains. "There just wasn't

any work on Broadway. I appeared in the show 'Harrigan and Hart,' and after putting a huge amount of time into it, it closed after three days. So I was taking jobs in places like Jupiter, Fla., and Milwaukee to be on stage, and I thought, 'Gee, is this really what I want to be doing? Doing stuff out of town just so I can come back and live in New York?' It wasn't. So I took the job on 'Valerie.'"

Then, when she was shown the script for the pilot episode of "The Cavanaugh's," Ebersole knew immediately that it was a role she wanted. "This was a role," she emphasizes. "A real chance to do something. Kit even got to do some singing, and I think she might get to do some more. And there's a lot of love that goes into this show."

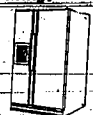

# Jed Allan changes the attitude of C.C. on soap 'Santa Barbara'

You can't teach an old dog new tricks, but if you catch him early ... That's what's happening on four-year-old "Santa Barbara," and it's one of the reasons the NBC soap walked off with the Best Show Daytime Emmy in June.

Jed Allan, who plays the soap's insufferable patriarch, C.C. Capwell, a man with the ego of Donald Trump and the mulishness of Ed Meese, now occasionally listens to others and admits his judgment can be wrong. That's not the old C.C. Capwell, a one-note character, a know-it-all who heard only his own voice. Frankly, C.C. was a pain because you always knew how he would react. He still is a pain, but less so.

"Playing C.C. only one way was boring," Allan explains. "And we underestimated the audience. C.C. still considers himself superior to his kids and anyone else in the show, but he's a shade more vulnerable. C.C.'s been fairly mellow during the writers' strike. When our regular staff returns to work I expect to tighten up the old boy and flaunt his arrogance again."

After 12 years as lawyer Don Craig on "Days of Our Lives," Allan changed NBC sound stages to become the fifth C.C. Capwell on the young soap. The first C.C. died of a heart attack. Number two lasted three weeks, number three a few months, and the fourth stayed a year.

C.C. meant a big leap in age for Allan. He had originally wanted the role but was told he was "too young." Desperate for strength, producer Bridget Dobson grabbed for Allan when the series was floundering.

"We've found our way," Allan declares. "At first, the show centered on the rich, spoiled Capwell clan. Fans weren't interested. When we broadened our base and began to experiment, audiences connected. Winning the Emmy helped; but we're still far from catching up to 'General Hospital' and 'Guiding Light.' I think we should move to one o'clock, the 'Another World' slot."

When Jed Allan started out, soaps lacked status and media interest. You could make a daytime splash and nothing would happen. Allan was ahead of his time, a workhorse before "General Hospital's" Tony Geary caught fire.

A daytime fixture who has always made a decent living, Jed, of course, would like a prime-time show or a good movie role, but that's dreaming.

"I've been labeled a 12:30-1:00 p.m. actor," Jed admits. "What a label! Now there's a new crowd doing the casting, and I'm asked what I've done. It makes me boil. The stigma of being a soap actor still remains. I can't beat

that. So I go to work and do my best."

# Networks scramble into the fall

HOLLYWOOD — Amid the debris left in the TV industry following the five-months-long writers strike, these pieces are now being picked up:

CBS finally unveiled its strategy for counterprogramming the monster of the Seoul Olympics. The weapons include seven new TV movies, at least 10 old ones, two college football games and specials about Jackie Gleason and Roger Rabbit.

CBS, surely the most vulnerable network this fall, presented a September schedule that offers mostly new (but hardly original) programming larded with a substantial helping of repeats, and no discernible blockbuster challenge to the likely Olympic runaway on NBC.

CBS also steered clear of going the "theme" month route to counter NBC as ABC did in announcing a schedule almost exclusively built on comedy.

The highlights for CBS may be the specials on Gleason (old clips and interviews) and Rabbit (insight into the making of the hit movie) as well as the Sept. 3 game between Florida State and Miami, one of the best match-ups of the college football season.

Among the low lights: repeats of such TV movies as "The Mayflower Madam," "Mistress" and the immortal "Kung Fu: The Movie."

Two networks are predicting that there will be no traditional mid-season for TV this year because of the delays caused by the strike.

Both CBS and ABC say that with fall series being pushed back so late into the fall (with some ABC series now openly bogged down until at least January), and with temporary commitments having been made to series that would have been thrown into the breach had the strike gone on, no new series are likely to be put into production for inclusion in a second-season strategy in early January.

CBS went farthest, all but writing off a mid-season this year.

NBC, meanwhile, conceded nothing. The most organized network will get itself into fighting trim faster than its competitors and Brandon Tartikoff, the programming leader,

said NBC will definitely have a mid-season, only it, too, will be delayed. Instead of taking place in January, it will likely be pushed back after the February sweep period.

The term "mid-season" will not exactly be accurate if it is launched in March or April as Tartikoff predicts. Maybe they will call it the "spring season."

This year's non-trend: the "dramedy."

Last year's chic new programming form, the filmed half-hour show with no laugh track, widely labeled the "dramedy," had several promising exemplars, notably "Frank's Place," "Slap Maxwell," "Hooperman," and "Molly Dodd."

Only "Hooperman" won a renewal for this fall. "Dodd" is exiled to the Lifetime cable channel, "Frank" is somewhere in limbo at CBS, and "Slap" was sent to the showers by ABC.

Now every new show that vaguely fits that old "dramedy" format wants about as much to do with the label "dramedy" as today's New Wave Democrats want to be associated with the label "liberal."

Steve Tisch (Uncle Larry owns the company), for example, practically swore a public oath here that his new series on CBS, "Dirty Dancing," is in no shape, manner or form a "dramedy." ("Dirty Dancing," by the way, is based on the movie of the same name, but not too literally—the family is no longer Jewish, the hotel is no longer in the Catskills, and Patrick Swayze is nowhere in sight.)

And Mary Tyler Moore, whose new comedy has the most overt "dramedy" feel of any new fall series, almost fled a press conference trying to disavow the "dramedy" label.

"Ours is not going to be in any way a 'dramedy,'" she insisted. Mainly, she said, she felt dramedies "very often left you feeling sad and hopeless." Not a sterling recommendation for new examples of the form.

ABC announced production plans

on a new miniseries: "The Kennedys of Massachusetts." It is projected at six hours, based on the book by Doris Kearns Goodwin, focusing on the family from the marriage of Joe and Rose to the inauguration of Jack.

This new production now may make possible, in conjunction with the hundreds of hours of previous Kennedy-related television projects, an entire syndication deal: "The Kennedy Show," a nightly hour-long strip: All Kennedys, all the time.

ABC is also doing an "authorized" biography of Liberace (CBS is doing an unauthorized version) and a "quirky" TV movie project with Katharine Hepburn, which she herself wrote. She plays herself, talks directly into the camera and, according to ABC's movie executives, "takes us into her confidence."

Vanna White has every intention of staying with "Wheel of Fortune," even if she makes it big playing the mythological goddess Venus in an upcoming NBC TV movie.

White remains committed to the game show, even the daytime version, until 1992. Host Pat Sajak is leaving the daytime version this winter, but White said she has no intention of applying to replace him.

"That's another thing in the tabloids — that I'm going to quit because I can't be host. I really don't want to be host because I think America has accepted me for what I do. I really don't have any desire to do that because then I'd have to work harder."

Need we say more?  
Fess Parker, first idol of America's baby boomers, will return to network TV this fall — as Davy Crockett.

NBC's new Disney series Sunday night will offer a "wheel" of four separate shows, one of which will be a new Crockett. Parker will play Davy as an older hero (still pre-Alamo, of course) who recalls his youth in conversations with the likes of Andrew Jackson.

The adventures will be carried out by a youthful Davy, played by a new, still uncast actor — coonskin cap and all.

## Jesse Jackson sues to keep video rights to his speech

NEW YORK — Last month, the Rev. Jesse Jackson, then a candidate for the presidency, gave an emotional, memorable speech at the Democratic convention. It was nationally televised and undoubtedly was taped by many viewers.

But does Jackson — who has said that he earned \$100,000 from selling videotapes of his speech to the party's convention in 1984 — have the sole right to sell videotapes of his rousing July 19 address in Atlanta?

The question has sparked a lawsuit by Jackson to stop MPI Home Video, based near Chicago, from selling and distributing its tape of the speech, a 50-minute videocassette entitled "Jesse Jackson: We Can Dream Again."

Two experts in the respective fields of copyright law and the First Amendment (neither of whom a participant in the suit) call the Jackson case unusual and possibly unprecedented.

It's a "plausible case," says the copyright expert, Harvard law professor Arthur Miller.

It also, says First Amendment expert Floyd Abrams, has serious ramifications about how free a politician's speech actually is.

"The law is not clear in this area," he says, referring to the question of whether a politician can claim ownership of video rights to speeches he makes in a public forum.

"The concern I have is giving political candidates seeking to offer themselves up to public scrutiny a veto power on the distribution of their speeches," Abrams says. "It cuts pretty deeply into the First Amendment."

In their federal court suit in Chicago, Jackson's lawyers argue that MPI has no right to sell its Jackson videotape, which had a \$14.95 list price and used uncut ABC footage that MPI bought from the network for \$6,500.

The video company's lawyers have argued that Jackson's speech in Atlanta was a news event unprotected by federal copyright law.

A day after filing their suit on July 28, Jackson's attorneys got a temporary restraining order — which last Friday was extended until Tuesday — that bars MPI from selling and distributing the tape.

Before that, the company had shipped about 7,100 cassettes, MPI Home Video President Walced B. Ali said in court.

Henry Mason, one of Jackson's attorneys, said that U.S. District Judge James B. Zagel will issue an opinion Tuesday on the request for a preliminary injunction. If granted, that would continue the ban until the case goes to trial Aug. 30.

The suit seeks a permanent injunction and as-yet unspecified damages, Mason said last Friday in a phone interview from Chicago.

Jackson, testifying in the case two weeks ago, said MPI's tape had cut into the market potential of one he planned to release and "has hurt our ability to make a living off my work," according to an Associated Press report.

Mason said that Jackson copyrighted his Atlanta speech after delivering it. The principal reason for that move, he said, was that Jackson had gotten "information that some people were going to appropriate" his speech — in other words, sell videocassettes of it.

## NBC tops Nielsens; Fox on move

NEW YORK (AP) — It was the same old thing at the top of the A.C. Nielsen Co. ratings last week — NBC was on top — but something foxy is stirring at the bottom of the list.

The Fox network posted its highest Sunday night ratings ever with a 5.6 average, led by "America's Most Wanted" with a best-ever rating of 7.9.

That was good for only 47th place in the list for the week ending Aug. 14, but it beats dead last, where the Fox programs started out.

Fox's "Married with Children" had a 7.4 rating on Sunday for 54th place; "21 Jump Street" had a 5.8 and 65th place; "The Garry Shandling Show" had a 5.2 and 66th place; "The Tracey Ullman Show" placed 69th with a 4.2; and "Duet" was 71st at 2.8.

NBC won the week — its eighth week in a row and 41 for 47 this season — by placing five of its Thursday night shows in the top 10. NBC had an average rating of 11.5, followed by CBS at 10.5 and ABC at 9.4.

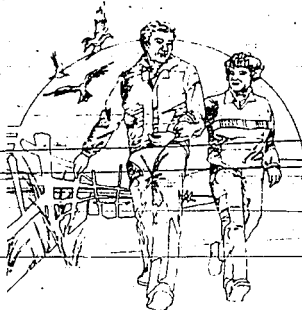
For the 47 weeks of the season,

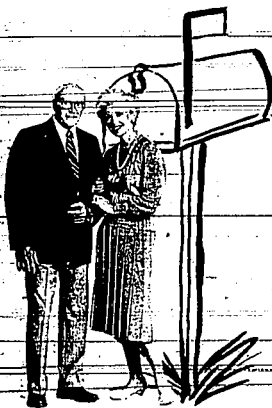
