Veterans shell findings of new Agent Orange study The Associated Press

CHICAGO — A new study of Vietnam veterans suggests that most escaped heavy exposure to the poison dioxin, even if they served as ground troops in areas extensively sprayed with the dioxin-containing herbicide Agent Orange.

But a Vietnam veterans spokesman criticized the study as a twisted rehash of old data and wid it middled example into

old data and said it misleads people into thinking smaller exposures were probably

harmless.

The study's findings, based on a com-parison of blood tests between 646 Vict-nam veterans and 97 non-Vietnam veter-ans, confirm results of three previous

studies on blood-levels of dioxin in similar subjects, researchers said.
"Current. TCDD (dioxin) levels were nearly identical in Vietnam and non-Vietnam veterans," researchers at the federal Centers for Disease Control reported in Priday's Journal of the American Medical Association.

Only two Vietnam veterans, or 0.3 per-cent of all 646 tested, had blood dioxin lev-els greater than 20 parts per trillion, con-sidered "clearly elevated," the researchers

"These two men each reported their health status as 'excellent and did not at-tribute any health problems to Agent Or-

ange exposure, the CDC researchers added.

The two men were not among the 14 percent of the Vietnam veterans in the study group who did link health problems to exposure.

This study is consistent with other studies and suggests that most U.S. Army ground troops who served in Victnam were not heavily exposed to TCDD (dioxim), except perhaps men whose job involved handling herbicides," the researchers said.

Dioxin stays, in the bloodstream for many years, and high levels of the chemi-cal can be measured with blood tests as

long as two decades after someone has been exposed, researchers said. The CDC said it conducted the latest study to explore whether military records of troop locations and locations of Agent Orange spraying might prove useful in identifying which veterans had been heav-

ily exposed.

It concluded that such records would be of no help, since its subjects were deliberately drawn from battalions that had served in the most heavily sprayed areas around-Saigon in-1967 and 1968.

CHICAGO — A new study of Vietnam veterans suggests: that most escaped heavy exposure to the poison dioxin, even if they served as ground troops in areas extensively sprayed with the dioxin-containing herbicide Agent Orange.

But a Vietnam veterans spokesman criticized the study as a twisted rehash of old data and said it misleads people into thinking smaller exposures were probably harmless.

The study's findings, based on a comparison of blood tests between 646 Victnam veterans and 97 non-Vietnam veterans, confirm results of three previous

studies on blood-levels of dioxin in similar subjects, researchers said.

"Current TCDD (dioxin) levels were nearly identical-in Vietnam and non-Victnam veterans," researchers at the feddral—study group who did link health problems to exposure.

Only two Vietnam veterans, or 0.3 percent of all 646 tested, had blood dioxin levels greater than 20 parts per trillion, considered "clearly clevated," the researchers said.

Dioxin stays in the bloodstream for many years, and high levels of the chemical can be measured with blood tests as

long as too decades after someone has been exposed, researchers said.

The CDC said it conducted the latest study to explore whether military records of troop locations and locations of Agent Orange spraying might prope useful in identifying which veterans had been heavily exposed.

It concluded that such records—would be of no help, since its subjects were deliberately drawn from battalions that had served in the most heavily sprayed areas around Saigon in 1987 and 1968.

I came away from the Vietnam experience with a deep sense of waste, not touilt for some of the actions I was involved in. ecause of these feelings, I have always questioned America's part in the war and always

will.

When I arrived in Vietnam Lfelt a patriotic
duty, not to mention the feeling of embarking
on a great adventure. You see, I had just
turned 19 two months before my arrival

For about the first month all things concerning war seemed to be as they should be, at least in my naive interpretation. It didn't take very long for me to realize that something was

amiss.

I was stationed at 53rd Signal Battalion, Il Teidd Forres, next to Longföinh.

Prostitutes were being methodically bussed into post by American Army trucks every Sunday. As soon as they arrived the ladies fanned out through the post like salesmen on a mission.

This event had to be the largest and most continuous army sanctioned orgy in the history of the United States Army. The casualties were unbelievable. Veneral disease was fairly-rampant. For many a GI these encounters were their first experience with a woman. Imagine their first impressions.

At any time of the day or week, you could go across the street opposite the main post gate and in broad daylight purchase some of the purest grade heroin for prices any stateside drug dealer today would envy, all from ten-year-old entrapreneurs intending their shaw year-old entrepreneurs intending their share of the profita to feed their families. I wonder is America really knows how many thousands of Glis died from overdoses or were sent home with a problem of drug addiction or alcohol-

In all the company areas, there were numer ous maids to accommodate the daily needs of the American GI, laundry, room cleaning and shiring better street. shining boots, etc.

These women of all ages worked their butts off all day for a few dollars. I know a veteran somewhere in this country that raped one of those maids and when a complaint was filed with command, the reply was essentially "Big deal, she is a gook."—
I was a member of a convoy leaving II Field Forces enroute to Suan-Lox that literally ran over a Vietnameses National and didn't even stop to lend aid. The natives trashed us with

insults, bottles, cans and garbage. We responded with like insults and threw their

insults, bottles, cans and gárbage. We responded with like insults and threw their trash back at them.

Vietnam was a tragedy, but it was even more an inexcusable blunder on the part of the American people as a whole. The suffering of the Vietnamese people was so immense for so many years, they almost reduced to an animal mentality.

Jane Fonda's efforts during the war were focused against the very act of war, not against a people or government. I applaud her efforts against the war.

Those who burned their draft cards were the real patriots. Those who protested the war were the real Americans. Those who wero draft dodgers sure had more sense than I did. The seum of the earth, are those people who initiate the killing of people and cultures for the sake of noble ideals and causes.

How can you judge a person foul or unpatriotic for refusing to take part in the destruction of his own race?



The project was developed by Jay Winsten, an assistant dean at the Harvard School of Public Health and director of its Center for Health Communication, to help combat the public health is sue of drinking and driving.—According to Winsten, 13 studies have agreed to include some character dialogue relating to the issue, and the three major networks have agreed to create and air public service advertisements during the season between Thankagiving and New Year's.—The asked them not for character development, not for an episode, said Winsten, but simply to lay in a line or two, so when a character is offered a drink, occasionally he will comfortably say, No thanks, I'm driving.
The idea, asye Winsten, is not

The idea, says Winsten, is not to inundate viewers with con-stant references but to casually and occasionally communicate what the public is increasingly aware of — that drinking and driving is dangerous. How the campaign will be played out in the upcoming tele-vision-season is still unclear.





# Emmys ratings please Fox

NEW YORK (AP) - It was the second lowest-rated Emmys show ever. but it was the highest-rated show ever for the Fox Broadcasting Co., according to figures from A.C. Nielsen Co.

The 40th Annual Emmy Awards" Yanked 33rd among network shows with a rating of 10:4 and an 18 share. It came in third Sunday behind "Police Academy 2: First Assignment" on NBC and "Blood and Orchids, Part 1" on CBS, but that didn't concern Fox President Jamie Kellner.

"I'm very pleased to be the No. 3 network nationally," Kellner said. "I also think that we put a great show

"It was a turning point for the Emmys and a wonderful night for Fox. It's the first time we've ever over-delivered for advertisers, so it was good for them, too," Kellner said. He said Fox had guaranteed a 10.0 rating. The show rated 10.7 during prime time, from 8-11 p.m. EDT.

The show received praise for comic innovations supplied by this year's executive producer, Lorne Michaela. producer of NBC's "Saturday Night Live." Last-year's-Emmys on Fox had a

rating of 8.8. When NBC carried the Emmys in 1986, it got a rating of 23.7 and a 36 share.

This is the second year of Fox's three-year deal to carry the Emmys. .. Otherwise, last week's programming was mostly reruns as the summer doldrums dragged on.

NBC's "The Cosby Show" was back in first place, followed by NBC's "A

Different World," "Cheers" "Night Court," CBS "60 Minutes" and "Murder, She Wrote," NBC's "Police ing Academy 2," "Golden Girls," "Amen and "Hunter."

NBC won the week ending Aug. 28 with an average, prime-time rating of new seat 12:2: CBS was second with a 9.7 and instead ABC had 8.9. But the three-network feet all share of 56 percent was a rebound from the all-time low 47 during the week of the Republican National Convention.

Each rating point represents 886,000 households with televisions. The share is a percentage of sets in

HOLLYWOOD - Some people are going to think "Group One Medical" is the product of a sick mind.

The new syndicated series from MGM-UA Telecommunications sounds like TV voyeurism at its worst real doctors, treating real patients with real medical problems, all for the viewing pleasure of a national audi-

At the very least, it seems like a conspicuous violation of a long-held, sacred trust of privacy between doctor and patient

"This is an exploitative show," said Dr. Ronald Pion; one of the show's cocreators and its chief medical consultant, during a recent interview on the

I don't think you can take real people and put them on television ... and not be considered exploiting their private lives," added Pion, who is clinical professor of obstetrics and gynecology at the University of California, Los Angeles. My question would be, to what end and for what purpose?"

The purpose, said everyone involved with the show, is to disseminate information and to help-viewers better understand and cope with medical problems (though a disclaimer at the start of the program recommends that viewers always consult with their doctors).

# Dynasty' will be cleaning up its act

NEW YORK (AP) - "Dynasty" isn't exactly turning into a bastion of high morality, but its new producer promises more meaningful relationships than affairs this season, and more ginger ale than gin-and-tonics.

David Paulsen, named executive ntoducer of the show as it begins its ninth season, said he's betting that more realism, more action and some new characters will attract more viewers — even as the characters clean up their acts.

"I don't think people will be popning in and out of every bed," he said. In the age of herpes and AIDS, it's ir-responsible to have flagrant bed hopping and I don't think we ought to do

He promised that men and women would develop less ephemeral relationships, and there would be less smoking and drinking on "Dynasty."

"We're going to cut that down, be-Paulsen said, although he cautioned that any one show should not be used he said. -

as a harometer of societal changes.

Paulsen, who was in New York auditioning actors and actresses for the show, is no stranger to glamorous prime-time soaps. He spent five years writing or directing more than 50 episodes of "Dallas." He also was supervising producer of "Knots Landing" for one year.

"Dynasty" finished the 1987-88 television season ranked-37th-out-of 85 regularly scheduled series.

Although he is planning some new wrinkles for "Dynasty," Paulsen said some of the strengths of the past will be revived.

"We'll see the character of Blake (Carrington) be a driving force again. The character was allowed to weaken." he said.

Blake will "lead the charge" of men with stronger personalities, he said. The women have always been the stronger force," he added.

Also, there will be more action in the episodes, and, he said, "we're going to tell a faster story.

# NBC airs Vincennes footage first

Ten days after the July 3 accident, in which all 290 persons aboard the plane were killed, NBC filed a request with the Pentagon for a copy of the Navy's video footage under provisions of the Freedom of Information Act.

The result: NBC aired Friday an excerpt from what the network's Washington bureau chief, Robert McFarland, said was a 34-minute tape of The tape was released earlier that day by the Pentagon.



Each half-hour show will contain several unscripted, unrehearsed office visits concerning a variety of medical concerns. In a recent taping, for example, a young woman dressed in a hospital gown and complaining of lower back pain discusses her problem with one of the show's three starring doctors (two men, one woman) as a camera crew quietly records the discussion. There are no breaks and no retakes, and after a few moments, one senses that both doctor and patient have forgotten that this is a television show (After the taping, in fact, the doctor gives the woman an on-the-set prescription).

Still, some viewers, Pion said, will watch for less than educational rea-

"Some will watch because they love to see people sicker than they are." Pion said. "Some will watch because they want to get free advice. Some of them will watch because they've got nothing else to do and they don't like what's on the other channel, and some are gonna watch because someone said. You ought to watch, there's this neat doctor on the program."

The "Group One" doctor most likely to get that kind of star treatment is Dr. Michael Gitter, a mustachioed source of information about health cross between Tom Selleck and Den-Friday, September 2, 1988

nis Weaver.

"I think (viewers) are going to be interested in the patients, the diseases

and the doctors." Gitter said. But the man with his finger on the pulse of the TV audience is Van Gordon Sauter, the controversial former president of CBS News and co-creator

as well as co-executive producer of "Group One Medical." Sauter said that the idea for such a show occurred to him not long ago in the middle of a speech he was giving to the American Medical Association.

Gazing out at the audience, his mind wandering, Sauter recalled thinking to himself, "My God, it's a room full of Judge Wapners!" (referring to the real-life judge of the popular courtroom series The People's Court").

But despite the obvious pitfalls - a temptation by doctors and patients to play to the cameras and the possibility that viewers may take to self-diagnosis - "Group One Medical" is much more than one might fear it is quacked up to be.

It has, for example, the American Medical Association's seal of approv-

### Futuristic TV moves closer

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Federal Communications Commission moved closer Thursday to authorizing futuristic television systems with movie film picture clarity and sound equal to that of compact discs.

The commission made preliminary findings that will allow research to proceed on the system, which is not likely to begin in the United States until the mid-1990s.

The FCC also sought public comment on options for using the airwaves for so-called high definition TV - considered the biggest television advance since color programming.

The commission tentatively decided that

-Existing broadcasters and stations are best equipped to bring the new system to viewers.

-Advanced television programs must be received on existing television-sets-so-current-equipment wouldn't become obsolete.

-If an additional frequency space is needed, it should be found within existing VHF and UHF television bands. The FCC found that looking for frequencies outside those bands would delay the service, and noted that bands now suitable for the system are in use for other purposes.

The commission asked for comment on three possible plans on using the hmadeast spectrum for advanced tale vision, and on a number of other technical issues. There would be a 60-day comment period and 30 days for replies

PCC Chairman Dennis R. Patrick and Commissioner Patricia Diaz Dennis supported the tentative plan in full. Commissioner James H. Quello dissented, saying the commission acted prematurely.

Quello said the FCC based its preliminary findings on computer projections and should have waited until the technology was tested and devel-

But Patrick said the technology to improve picture resolution exists tonday, and the FCC should spur further research and development.

His view was supported by Ma. Dennis, who said: "Some urge us to move more blowly, to wait for more evidehce-before acting. That is tempting...But delay creates significant costa.

Although Patrick said the preliminary rulings would "put the U.S. in the forefront of the international quest for new TV technology," the Japanese have been working on an advanced system for two decades.

They plan to offer a preview with broadcasts of the summer Olympics to high definition TV sets in about 50 big-city department stores throughout Japan.

"If you're a patient and for whatever reason you decide to share your story with Group One Medical, there's no doubt in your mind that you're coming to a studio, you're coming to a television show and this ain't walk-in medicine," Pion "Nobody's coming on the show for the promise of care.

With the increasing popularity of "reality-based" programming coupled with the public's interest in health and medicine, the program has hit po-

tential. Certain examinations and graphic procedures will, of course, be somewhat off limits as common sense and TV standards of taste dictate, but the dramatic opportunities seem limitless.
