Polls favor Bentsen following campaign debate

Democrat Michael Dukakis criticized Dan

Democrat Michael Dukakis criticized Dan Quayle in campaign rhetoric and commercials on Thursday, saying the Republican vice-presidential candidate appeared "extremely insecure" in debate. George Bush praised his-running mate's performance but quickly changed the subject to crime control. Quayle shook off a poll suggesting that Democrat Lioyd Bentsen beat him handily in their debate Wednesday night and said the Republicans are still "anded" in the race for the White House. Most pre-debate surveys gave Bush a slight advantage over Dukakis with a little over a month remaining in the campaign.

Bentsen preferred an instant ABC poll rating in the debate winner by 51 percent to

27 percent. I was just delighted," said the Texas senator. That finding was reinforced by a CBS poll Thursday that found Bentsen the winner by 50 to 27. The CBS poll found Quayle was rated as qualified to be president by 47 percent, up from 37 percent who rated im qualified before the debate. Bentsen was rated as qualified by 78 percent, up from 64 percent.

Dressed in a white military uniform, Pinochet spoke without bitterness about his drubbing Wednesday
in a plebiscite in which he sought
eight more years in power.

Barlier in the day, thousands-of-Chileans poured into the streets-of-the capital in a pontaneous celebrations of Pinechet's crushing defeat at the polls, but the party in downtown Santiago degenerated into violent strings with rot police.

The street reliebrations followed by hours the resignation of Pinechet's capital. All in members quit to allow the general to appoint new ministers are expected, to be dropped in the new hineup to be announced Friday.

While saying he accepted the people's verdict, Pinechet stated that he stood by the 1980 constitution, which guarantees him and the military broad powers despite his defeat. He thus implicitly brushed aside the opposition's demand for negotiations to change the military drafted constitution, which was approved in a taint-deferendum, and to allow a faster and more complete transition to full-democratic rule.

Chile will continue its march to full democracy, and no one will-stop that process. But he added, 'One must not alter the constitutional order of the repub-lic and no one claims the mandate of the people to twist that which the people themselves decided.' Interior Minister Sergio Fernan-dez said the plebiscite signified 'that we have arrived at full democracy in Chile."

Although the number of satellites and rockets has been classified, some experts report that the initial plans called for as many as 3,000 rockets, with each satellite carrying 10.

The new design for the first phase was prompted by an order to review SDI costs that Secretary of Defense Frank C. Carlucci issued shortly after taking office last November.





Recent nuclear stories should cause concern

Two related stories from different parts of the country in recent weeks should alert Southern Idaho citizens to both the potential promise and the continuing hazards of the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory at Idaho Falls.

One article, from mid-September, should sound a particu-lar warning bell. It states that Department of Energy offi-cials and others have placed a permanent hold on the ship-ment of any toxic or nuclear waste to a new facility in New Mexico until they are certain the facility is ready.

The upshot of the delay means the indefinite continuation of INEL as a temporary waste storage facility. Once again, it means the DOEs proposed cleanup of the INEL site is behind schedule.

The second article, from South Carolina this week, reported that for nearly 30 years, the Department of Energy has routinely suppressed information about serious nuclear incidents at the Savannah River nuclear plant, the nations aging facility for the manufacture of nuclear weapons.

Ing facinity for the manufacture of macro series and the best light on the report, saying it should be seen as an indication that the nation needs to update its nuclear production and that a backup plant at INEL is appropriate.

But we think the latest Savannah River report will have the reverse effect in that it will be seen as a further warning that the Department of Energy has a very poor record in maintaining its nuclear plants and that it is less than forthright in what it says about the safety of its operations.

—All of this should reinforce the concern many. Southern Idahoans have about the operations at INEL and their potential impact on the state and the Magic Valley in particular.

We continue to believe that INEL ought to focus its attention on cleanup of the millions of pounds of nuclear waste already on the site and on maintaining the purity of the aguifer on which Southern Idaho depends. The latest problems at Savannah River and the New Mexico waste disposal site suggest that Idahoans may well need to ask for tougher measures to assure that the delays do not mean more potential pollution here.

Typically, Idahoans have trusted government agencies like the Department of Energy, but these latest problems also suggest that the trust may need to be reexamined.

It may well be time for all of us to say, as they do in Neva-

Book shows that school districts can be rated objectively

A woman called the other day from a Houston suburb to thank me for letting her and her friends know what was wrong with their school district. "We've been trying to figure it out, but couldn't put our finger on it," she said. "Now we know enough to run our campaign against incumbent school board members."

She called me because she had read my book "Public Schools USA," a comparative guide to about 500 school districts in 50 major metropolitan areas of the country. What I had done was assemble 22 statistics about her school district and some insightful comments by non-educators who knew the schools well.

But my main purpose had been to provide information about school districts in the

schools well.

But my main purpose had been to provide information about school districts in the Houston area so that a family in New Hampshire or Nebraska that was planning a move to Houston would have solid data to help decide on housing and schools. While I was trying primarily to help outsiders moving into a district, the woman in Texas was telling methat people need help evaluating the schools where they stready are sending their children.

While the districts are under no obligation to send their statistics to me, they should feel obliged to supply them to parents of schoolchildren and taxpayers in their jurisdiction. Most of the statistics are readily available (average daily attendance, current expense per pupil, teacher-student ratios, teacher salaries, etc.). Indeed, many districts publish some statistics about their schools in a newsletter or local newspaper. People who want to evaluate their schools can compare data from their district with data for other districts in the area, in the state, or in other states. If you note, for example, that your district offers only a couple of advanced placement courses and the district next door offers 11, you have grounds for a sking some hard questions of district administrators and school board members.

members.
If you are concerned about students' understanding and appreciation of the arts and see that districts in your area supply no mu-sic and art specialists while most districts in the nation do, the disclosure might lead to

the nation do, the disclosure might lead to curriculum revisions.

Also, it does not take a \$500-per-day consultant to tell parents and taxpayers that the program for gifted children consists mostly, of busy work, or that the schools are doing fittle to prepare a large chunk of the student body-for gainful employment after graduation. The woman in the flouston area said that her eyes were suddenly opened when she read this comment about the quality of school

leadership in her district: "Internal politics play a major part in principal selection; the old boy network is very much in operation..." Why was this an eye-opener? The comment was not mine; it came from a few-knowledgeable residents of the district, perhaps an active parent who lived down the street from the caller, or maybe a former teacher in the system.

Not only professional interviewers can ask people searching questions. An 'old boy network' usually has been entrenched for years and is no secret to lay people who are astute observers of the school system. In addition to using the statistics and comments in "Public Schools USA" for district evaluation, people would do well to examine other sources of information about their schools and compare the data with other districts: the data with other districts:

Reports of standardized achievement test-scores listed by grade. Reports by state and regional accrediting agencies. Studies con-ducted by such respected local organizations as the League of Women Voters and Ameri-can Association of University Women. It is al-ways a good idea to look at data over a period

of five to 10 years, if possible, to note trends. A warning is in order. Some educators and school boards become engry and defensive when outsiders start evaluating their own schools and comparing them to other districts, particularly, of course, when the evaluation places the local schools in a poor light.

For example, a school board member in California, when asked to explain why SAT scores in his district were lower than scores in neighboring districts, replied that SAT scores may indicate something about individual students, but nothing about the quality of education in the district.

He honestly said that, and on the same day a superintendent in New Jersey, waiting to address graduates from a state college, was being praised for raising SAT scores in his district by 20 points during his 15-year.





Of specific concern to the Public Lands Committee this week, Holden said, was the distribution formula for the 70 percent of the trust fund money that is not directly allegated by the current plans to states and their political subdivisions.







Some of these sales representatives employ calculated deception and outripht lies, conveying the impression of an ongoing business relationship with the victim firms by implying or actually stating they are the firm's regular supplier, Jones said.

Burley Area Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Bill Schafer, presenting the request to the council, said lanthaning the runway could encurage business into the area. Many corporate jets, he said, recuire a runway of 4,500 feet, while the longest Burley runway is 4,00 feet.

Company confirms Johnson's doctor purchased steroids

NEW YORK (AP) — Sales records between Ben Johnson's doctor and the maker of the anabolic steroid-found in the runner's system at the Olympic Games in Seoul will not be

olympic Games in Seoul will not be released to the public, medical authorities said Thursday. Spokesmen for Sterling Orac Idd., the only manufacturer and distributor of stanozolol in North America, have confirmed that Dr. George Mario Jamie Astaphan putchased the steroid from the company.

Corp., Adaphan said he has pro-scribed some anabolic steroids to some patients, but he did not say what type.

Efforts Thursday to reach Astaphan at his home and office in both Canada and St. Kitt's were not successful.

Steroids, which promote muscle development, are banned by the International Olympic Committee and have been linked to many dangerous side effects, including cancer. Stamozolol, normally prescribed only for very anemic patients, is considered one of the most dangerous anabolic steroids.

Anabolic steroids can be used for a teen-ager who has not gone through puberty or a grown, man with a sexual dysfunction, said Dr. Jerald Bain, an endochronologist at Mount Sinai Hospital at the University of Toronto. He said there is no evidence the drug provides, physical benefits for abhletes.

Stanozolol is a synthetic derivative of testotezone, a male hormone. The drug's actions are similar to those of male hormones and can cause serious disturbances of growth fand sexual development if given to young children. Anabolic steroids can be used for teen ager who has not gone



TWIN FALIS.—"I never realized what this family went through—trapped up in that attic—but this is real. This is reality."
Those are the words of College of Southern Idaho sophomore Sjamerman as she prepares to undertake the starring role in the school's upcoming production of "The Diary of Anna Frank."

Zimmerman, who is not Jewish, has prepared to play the young Jewish girl by dying her blonde hair brown and studying the book by Mieg Geis, the woman who helped hide the Franks from the Nazi armies during World War II. "These kids are very young to be as good as they are," said Tony Mannen, who has been teaching drama at the college for the past 14 years.

Mannen, who directs the school's two or three main 'stage shows each year, was the one who selected the play. "I have quality students who can do this kind of play," he said. "We had an extremely successful season last year, and 95 percent of those actors are back, in addition to some really good new recruits." ally good new recruits.

Another reason why Mannen chose this particular play, he said, is because of the recent television show about Geis and because he heard the woman interviewed on the 'Today Show.' He began thinking about how courageous she must be, even now, to speak out about having hidden the Franks. The script Mannen chose is the same one that won the Today Award in the late '50s, he said. It also happens to be the first play in which he ever acted, as a 16-year-old high school student.

At the beginning of the play, the Frank family has emigrated to Amsterdam, where they are hidden in a non-room attle. of the building—in-which Mr. Frank once had his business. Two of his employees, Mr. Krahler and Geis, have agreed to hide them. The play focuses on the events and pressures surrounding the eight members of two families. who lived in that attic for two years. It is a depiction of how the two families dealt with each other and former leationships with each other over the space of time.

Mannen works hard to build trust-among-his actors, he explained, and-he expects them to put forth-100-per-cent effort every day. His two work-study students even stay with him during the all-night work session when he designs a play's set. Around 120-hours of rehearsal time are re-quired for each play presented.

Mannen does not, however, require his students to learn dialects for plays in which they perform, "You







Reba McEntire hits top of the charts with 5 gold records and a new album

Reba McEntire is on top of the country music world. After five gold records... a new album entitled Reba" and a passel of awards, she just now may be hitting her stride: in the same breath as Tammy, Loretta and Patsy.

Past year, McEntire received the Female Vocalist of the Year award from the Country Music Association - for the fourth consecutive year — surpassing the record set by living legends Taminy Wynette and Loretta Lynn, who had both won three years fit a row. And when McEntire attends this year's CMA awards, airing Oct. 10 on CBS, she stands a good chance of whining Entertainer of the Year

for the second time. Many of McEntire's songs speak to women, but that has never limited her audience. "You know, I've found women like my music men like it too." She has even received fan mail from men saying, "What, do you mean this is women's music?" McEntire also has a large following of young people, who tradi-tionally have not been fam of coun-try music. "I don't like to be categor-ized," McEntire emphasizes. "I think the sought a sing appeal to everyone, and I believe that is a hig part of my popularity." In fact, McEntire recently emerged in the top 10 of a Gallup Poli of teens' favorite female singers, ahead of Cyndi Lauper and Stevie Nicks.

"My philosophy has always been the same," says McEntire. "I choose my own songs, and I look for the best ones I can find. If I like a song, it doesn't matter what style it is. Then, when I do an album or get my tour together, I listen to the songs over and over again. When there's one I don't get tired of, I know it's a good

McEntire grew up in Oklahoma, the daughter of a schoolteacher and a rancher. Both her father and her grandfather were world-champion steer ropers, and she traveled the rodeo barrel-racing circuit.

It was at a rodeo in 1975 that McEntire was discovered by a Nashville songwriter as she was singing the national anthem. She began her career singing traditional country music — when no one else was doing it. Today her repertoire still include hardline country, but she has also moved into pop, even R&B. What has made McEntire a success is the depth and versatility of her voice. She moves from ballad to Western swing to pop standard with ease. And with her enstural coloratura, some critics say McEntire should try singing opera

Today, McEntire lives in Nash-ville, where she recently moved from Oklahoma. She has complete control of her career and has her entire operation under one roof. "Everything's right here in one building, management, booking, publicity, we even park the tour buses in here," she laughs.

Meredith Baxter Birney drops glamour to play new role

Meredith Baxter Birney sheds all pretense of glamor this week to play Winnie Sprockett, who spent almost her entire life in a Kansas mental institution but never lost hope.

In a A sepia-tinted introduction. "Winnie" begins in 1941, as the orphan rides in the back seat of a car across the Kansas plains to Middleton, the hospital that would become

her home.

Wordless, the child turns huge eyes toward the woman who left her there - and who would raise Winnie's two sisters - as a nurse leads her down an empty hallway.

A series of quick stills shows the little girl in various sad stages of growing up there, That, Birney said,

"brought tears to my eyes"

But Birney is quick to point out that "this isn't a tear-jerker" - although viewers may find certain

scenes touching.

Rather, it is a story of a moderately mentally retarded woman who endures brutality at the institution, but who also finds friends there, who tries to make life easier for others and who takes great joy in her ability to read she's fascinated by a book by Pearl S. Buck for example - and in keeping a impral that she hopes will one day be published.

She also dreams of life outside and manages to persuade her boyfriend Thomas to run away and give the outside world a try. After a fairly delightful day - "I'm filled up with the beauty of the world," says Winnie they speffd the night in a car, then are returned to Middleton the next morning by a policeman. Winnie pays for her freedom by being placed in isolation by a sadistic matron

"Winnie" was filmed at a Veterans Administration hospital in Los Angeles, but Birney and co-star David Morse spent time researching their roles at two centers for the mentally retarded in the area

Birney said she had planned to sit quietly and observe the residents but found instead that they - avid TV fans all - would turn from their almost continual TV-watching to wave and smile at the actors. They didn't seem to care much about why she and Morse were there, however, "They thought it was neat," she said, "but they never asked why."

What many did want, however, was to be in the film. Some got their wish.

Director John Korty used several of the residents in a party sequence that features a musical group, The High scribed as mentally retarded but mu-

cause here I was, a whole person. said Birney. She came to realize that "there's something so very loving about them. I was very concerned about what they thought.

She said she worried that the would wonder why she was acting differently in "Winnie" than she did in NBC's "Family Ties," soon to begin its seventh and last season. As it turned out, she said, "they didn't think anything of it.

"There seems to be a correlation of mental disability and lack of dental hygiene," she said, "That's one of the reasons I used a small appliance in my mouth, to discolor the teeth and protrude them slightly."

The voice Birney uses in her role is jarring - nasal, harsh, unmodulated. and very much like the real Winnie's voice, she said. "I got the voice very. very close to Winnie's voice - but it was so shrill, if anything I had to take it down a bit," said Birney.



"The actual performance by the Olympics in key groups (of viewers) was a really dominant performance. Whether it was as dominant as anticipated, that's something else," said Gerald Jaffe, NBC vice president for research projects.

He said NBC intended to research the reason for the low-rated performance, but would not likely make the results public. The time difference between the United States and Korea. the late September timing of the event and a general decline in network ratings are likely contributors.

CBS and ABC rebounded against the Olympics on Sunday when the closing ceremonies had a lowly 12.3.

Q: I've noticed syndicated re- those extra minutes of time for ads. runs of "The A Team" with, apparently, scenes cut out or shortened. Why?

A: What you are seeing has become common industry practice when it comes to syndicated programs. In the case of "The A Team," the distributor (MCA) sends a station pre-edited episodes (about 90 seconds are deleted) that allows the station that much more time to insert commercials. There is one other way in which a program can be shortened, but it is not quite as noticeable to the viewer. That is the practice, particularly used with movies, in which a machine (Lexicon) actually speeds up the film ever so slightly, and thereby gives the station Donal Donnelly ("The Knack").
