Polls favor Bentsen following campaign debate

Democrat Michael Dukakis criticized Dan Quayle in campaign rhetoric and commercials on Thursday, saying the Republican vice-presidential candidate appeared "extremely insecure" in debate. George Bush praised his running mate's performance but quickly changed the subject to crime control. Quayle shook off a poll suggesting that Democrat Lloyd Bentsen beat him handily in their debate Wednesday night and said the Republicans are "still ahead" in the race for the White House. Most pre-debate surveys gave Bush a slight advantage over Dukakis with a little over a month remaining in the campaign.

27 percent. I was just delighted," said the Texas senator. That finding was reinforced by a CBS poll Thursday that found Bentsen the winner by 50 to 27. The CBS poll found Quayle was rated as qualified to be president by 47 percent, up from 37 percent who rated him qualified before the debate. Bentsen was rated as qualified by 78 percent, up from 64 percent.

The highlight of the debate came as the 41-year-old Quayle said his experience in Congress compared favorably with John F. Kennedy's record at the time of the 1960 campaign.

"Senator, you're not Jack Kennedy," Bentsen shot back.

The Dukakis campaign rushed to air two television commercials questioning Quayle's qualifications. One showed pictures of Harry

Truman, Lyndon Johnson and Gerald Ford, all vice presidents who succeeded to the presidency without an election, while an announcer said Bush's pick of Quayle as running mate marked a "lapse of judgment."

Dukakis told reporters aboard his campaign jet en route to Texas the debate was a "real plus for us" and called Quayle's performance "very disturbing."

"I thought he was programmed beyond belief ... extremely insecure, this fellow," Dukakis said in Lone Star, Texas, where he campaigned together with Bentsen. "He didn't have a sense of strength or control or anything. ... Thinking about Quayle being a heartbeat away from the presidency, to watch that, I think, is very, very troubling."

Republicans from Ford to Ronald Reagan rallied to Quayle's cause as the Bush organi-

zation appeared to be practicing damage control.

Bush aides conspicuously violated their rule about publicly discussing polls. Campaign manager Lee Atwater said the vice president was ahead in Michigan and New Jersey, two key swing states. He predicted the vice president would carry Bentsen's home state of Texas by at least six points.

"This race is going to quickly get back to the two candidates for president," Atwater said. "There are two gladiators in the arena that are going to count in the end."

In Midland, Texas, campaign signs distributed to children attending a Bush campaign rally said, "Dan's no JFK. Thank God."

Bush delivered his first speech of the day on crime without mention of his running

mate or the debate. Instead, he ridiculed a Massachusetts prison furlough program by mimicking tough-guy actor Clint Eastwood's popular refrain "make my day."

"My opponent's answer is slightly different," Bush said. "His motto is: 'Go ahead, have a nice weekend!'"

He praised Quayle's performance as he warmed up for a morning jog, though, and later told a rally in Midland, Texas, "I think Dan Quayle did an outstanding job."

Reagan, coming to Quayle's defense, said Bentsen resorted to a "cheap shot ... unbecoming a senator of the United States" with his much-quoted debate put-down of the GOP vice-presidential candidate.

Bentsen disputed any suggestion of nastiness on his part.

Ignores opposition demands for talks

Pinochet accepts defeat

SANTIAGO, Chile — Gen. Augusto Pinochet declared Thursday night that he accepted his defeat at the polls as part of the process of restoring democracy in Chile, but he rejected the opposition's demand for talks on changing the constitution to reduce the military's sweeping powers. Dressed in a white military uniform, Pinochet spoke without bitterness about his drubbing Wednesday in a plebiscite in which he sought eight more years in power.

Earlier in the day, thousands of Chileans poured into the streets of the capital in spontaneous celebrations of Pinochet's crushing defeat at the polls, but the party in downtown Santiago degenerated into violent skirmishes with riot police.

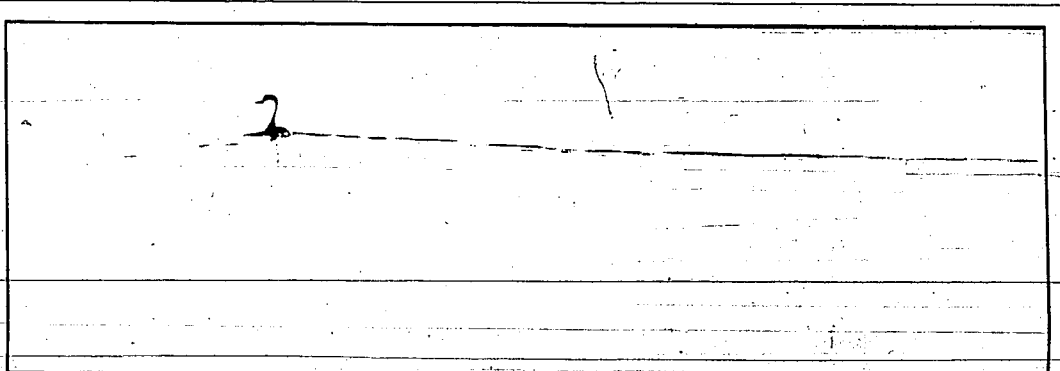
The street celebrations followed by hours the resignation of Pinochet's cabinet. All 16 members quit to allow the general to appoint new ministers if he wanted. At least some ministers are expected to be dropped in the new lineup to be announced Friday.

While saying he accepted the people's verdict, Pinochet stated that he stood by the 1980 constitution, which guarantees him and the military broad powers despite his defeat. He thus implicitly brushed aside the opposition's demand for negotiations to change the military-drafted constitution, which was approved in a tainted referendum, and to allow a faster and more complete transition to full democratic rule.

In his first public remarks since the results became known nearly 24 hours earlier, Pinochet said on national television: "Let no one be fooled. Chile will continue its march to full democracy, and no one will stop that process."

But he added, "One must not alter the constitutional order of the republic and no one claims the mandate of the people to twist that which the people themselves decided."

Interior Minister Sergio Fernandez said the plebiscite signified "that we have arrived at full democracy in Chile."

DOE report recommends changes at nuclear facility

AIKEN, S.C. — The day after an Energy Department draft report sharply criticized Savannah River Plant management, the nuclear facility suffered an equipment failure that led to a release of radioactive tritium gas.

The escape of less than .01 millirems of the gas into the atmosphere Thursday morning posed no threat to health, said plant spokeswoman Becky Craft. Workers at the plant, the nation's only producer of weapons-grade plutonium and tritium, were not evacuated, and the mayor said, "The town's not upset at all."

"The tritium ... was released into the atmosphere from the facility's stack," a statement issued by the plant's management said. "The accidental release occurred as the result of equipment failure during routine operations inside the Tritium Facility."

A millirem is a measure of radiation; a routine chest X-ray totals about 20 millirems, according to Ms. Craft.

The draft report criticized the Energy Department and its prime contractor at the plant, Du Pont, for poor staff training, poor communications and sloppy operating procedures that have undermined safety.

The 50-page report made a host of recommendations, including stepping up oversight so problems can be caught before they become serious.

In Washington, five senators Thursday asked an independent committee to review safety and opera-

tions at the plant in the wake of disclosures that as many as 30 major mishaps over 30 years had not been reported to Energy Department headquarters or made public.

Sens. Ernest Hollings, D-S.C.; James McClure, R-Idaho; Bennett Johnston, D-La., and Mark Hatfield, R-Ore., called for an investigation by the Advisory Committee on Nuclear Facilities Safety, which was established by Energy Secretary John Herrington to give independent assessments of operations at nuclear facilities.

The New York Times on Thursday reported that a study by a consulting firm of the plant's operations from 1971-1987 showed that chronic equipment failure and poor operating procedures caused nuclear reactors to shut down unexpectedly nine to 12 times a year for nearly two decades.

That rate is twice that of the civilian nuclear power industry, and Richard W. Starostski, the Energy Department's chief safety operator, told the newspaper that civilian reactors with the same number of forced shutdowns would have had their operating licenses revoked.

At the Statehouse in Columbia, a dozen people held a two-hour vigil Thursday morning.

"These types of mishaps are serious. It's scary to hear that they've had fuel melts," said Michael Lowe of the environmental action group Greenpeace.

SDI price tag down, but lawmakers wary

WASHINGTON — The Department of Defense announced Thursday that it has sliced \$46 billion from the estimated cost of the first phase of the "Star Wars" program, which continues to stress the development of space-based weapons to intercept attacking Soviet nuclear missiles. The dramatic cost-cutting brought the first-phase price tag down from

\$115 billion to \$69 billion, a new "realistic" figure reflecting recent technological advances and a significant redesign of the program, Pentagon officials said at a joint hearing of the Senate and House Armed Services Committees.

"This is a startling change," said Robert Costello, undersecretary of defense for acquisition, one of three officials who exulted over the new

Brawley case ends; jury calls it a hoax

POUGHKEEPSIE, N.Y. — Tawana Brawley's tale of rape by a gang of whites was a lie fanned into a source of racial tension through the "hucksterism and opportunism" of her advisers, New York's attorney general said Thursday.

"We have the facts. We have solved the case. The allegations she had made are false," Robert Abrams said

as he released copies of an exhaustive, 170-page grand jury investigation of the black teen-ager's story.

The grand jury said it found no evidence of sexual assault and said Miss Brawley herself was responsible for the degraded condition in which she was found after a four-day disappearance last November.

The investigation received no cooperation from Miss Brawley or her

State charges Murtaugh, Kimberly residents with stock fraud

TWIN FALLS — A Kimberly woman and two Murtaugh residents are accused of a \$90,000 stock fraud in a lawsuit filed by the Idaho Department of Finance.

The suit, filed Wednesday in 5th District Court in Twin Falls County, charges the trio and a Delaware corporation they formed with setting up an agricultural scheme that promised farmers reduced prices on supplies and higher prices for crops.

The suit names Helen Ruth Savage of Kimberly, Gary Nebeker of Murtaugh, Louise Ward of Murtaugh and AFM Agricultural Finance and Management Ltd., a Delaware corporation of which Savage is president.

Nebeker is a former part owner of Magic Mountain S&B Resort.

None of the three defendants was available for comment Thursday.

Six investors bought at least \$90,000 in stock, the department said. According to the lawsuit, AFM was incorporated in September 1987, supposedly to help farmers buy machinery, feed, seed and other supplies at 25 percent discounts and to sell crops at prices as much as 25 percent above market prices.

Savage then started offering stock in AFM, the state says. The suit alleges six people invested \$15,000 each in the corporation, and Savage was trying to get 20 to 25 people to invest at the \$15,000 level — to form a nucleus for AFM. The original investors supposed-

ly would be followed by "several thousand farmer/investors," according to the suit.

In February 1988, Savage prepared a Confidential Private Offering Memorandum and asked the state for an exemption from registration with the Securities and Exchange Commission and the Department of Finance. She withdrew her request after copies of the private offering were distributed around Murtaugh and Kimberly, and Savage and the other defendants tried to retrieve copies of the memorandum, according to the state.

In this case, they sold stock and then filed for exemption, and we said sorry, you don't qualify," said Wayne Klein, bureau chief in the Idaho Department of Finance.

Savage and Nebeker continued to offer stock in the AFM program, according to the

suit.

"This is unusual, but interestingly, the schemes that are directed at farmers are some of the most unusual," Klein said. The lawsuit charges Savage, Nebeker and Ward with not registering the securities, not being licensed to offer or sell securities, making misrepresentations and omissions while promoting AFM and using fraudulent and deceptive practices.

The department wants the court to determine whether the trio broke the law and seeks an injunction prohibiting further violations of money to investors.

Klein said the money the trio raised was to be sent to a man in Europe for unspecified purposes. The man, Joseph Walch, was the

target of a successful lawsuit alleging loan fraud a few years ago.

"In that case, Walch and a man named Ken Powers solicited advance fees from Magic Valley farmers. They told farmers a Liechtenstein company would then put together a loan package at low interest rates, said David High, an Idaho deputy attorney general.

The loans never came through, High said, and the state sued. Eventually, Walch and the other defendants returned the money.

"We encourage people to be very skeptical of claims that someone can get them money or supplies or profit that are significantly different than what market exists are," Klein said. "If someone offers you a substantial return, you can be sure there's a lot of risk."



# Police arrest 100 in abortion protest

ATLANTA (AP) — About 100 people protested outside a clinic today in Atlanta's third day of anti-abortion demonstrations and police dragged away at least seven people for climbing barricades outside the building.

The protesters were arrested near the Feminist Women's Health Center. Police asked them to walk to the vans and when they refused, they were dragged about 200 feet in the vehicles and taken to jail.

The rest of the protesters stood outside the barricades, singing hymns.

Meanwhile, protest leaders are claiming continued success in their promised "Siege of Atlanta," despite dwindling numbers at nightly rallies and fewer demonstrations at daytime protests.

On Tuesday, helmeted police officers stood guard at the Feminist Women's Health Center as patients inside huddled and employees went about their business and protesters outside shouted Bible verses.

The clinic is one of seven targeted by Operation Rescue, the New York-based group staging demonstrations here this week. The number of demonstrators has dwindled since Tuesday, when 243 were arrested on misdemeanor charges.

Fourteen were arrested Wednesday, said City Solicitor Raines Carter said.

Three of them were charged with simple assault when a patient they

tried to bar from Feminist Women's Health Center stumbled and fell.

Protest leaders who dubbed this week's protests the "Siege of Atlanta" said they have prevented abortions with their demonstrations, which include attempting to blockade en-

trances.

Clinic officials disputed that and said aside from some rescheduling of appointments, business has not been affected.

But a 21-year-old patient said she was horrified by the severity of the

protests as she arrived at the clinic Wednesday. "You've got people trying themselves on the ground trying to trip you up and make you fall, pecking under the umbrella and all that," she said, speaking on condition of anonymity.

# VA cabinet bill goes to Senate

WASHINGTON (AP) — Paying election-year homage to the nation's 27 million veterans, the House gave easy approval Thursday to a bill that would transfer the Veterans Administration into the government's 14th cabinet department.

The lawmakers approved the measure on a voice vote and sent it to the Senate, where passage was considered likely. President Reagan supports the bill.

In approving the change, the House rejected arguments that setting up the new department will lead ultimately to increased spending on veterans programs and admissions that it was taking an unwise action because of election-driven generosity.

The new Department of Veterans Affairs would represent the fifth new cabinet department since 1960. Opponents noted that it would come ironically because of support from Reagan, who began his presidency promising to eliminate two cabinet departments, Education and Energy — an idea he later abandoned.

"This says to the millions of men and women who've worn the uniform of our armed forces that we care," said Rep. Frank Horton, R-N.Y. He said placing a representative of the nation's veterans at the table with the president and other cabinet members will give greater voice to their needs.

A primary sponsor of the measure, Rep. Gerald Solomon, R-N.Y.,

noted that the VA hospital system is suffering from a \$600 million budget shortfall and that Cabinet status would help it make the case for full funding.

"This will go a long way toward guaranteeing that the veterans of the future are going to be taken care of," Solomon said.

But Rep. John Porter, R-Ill., said giving veterans greater lobbying clout at the White House will lead to higher costs for their programs.

"This is an act of great hypocrisy," said Porter, who said he had heard numerous colleagues complain privately that the legislation should not be adopted.

Why does Congress do things like that? He said it's because of special interests, Porter said. "Members are in craven fear of retribution at the polls. I think the American people are looking to have people of courage to govern them. You can't serve every special interest in our country without ever adding up the bottom line."

The VA, according to legislation supporters, already has the fifth-largest budget among federal agencies and merits being put on par with other departments to ensure money is administered properly.

According to the Veterans Affairs Committee, VA serves 27 million veterans and 49 million dependents or survivors with a budget of \$30 billion. It will dispense \$14 billion in income maintenance and \$625 million for education and rehabilitation assistance this year.

# Senate OKs tax exemption for interest on ed bonds

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate on Thursday seized one of the most popular issues of the presidential campaign and on a 94-0 vote approved a tax exemption for interest on U.S. savings bonds that are used to finance a college education.

The proposal, which was introduced last year by Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., and included in President Reagan's budget this year, was added

to a tax bill with an uncertain future. The bill was designed chiefly to correct errors and misunderstandings in the 1986 tax overhaul.

The measure also includes some tax breaks worth about \$2.7 billion over three years and the tax increases to pay for them. A larger bill, with a \$7.5 billion pricetag, has been approved by the House, and there is no assurance a compromise

can be agreed on by both chambers before Congress adjourns for the year.

The Senate bill has benefits for farmers and other off-road users of diesel, first-time homebuyers, corporate research efforts and workers who receive educational or legal assistance from employers. The measure includes a "bill of rights" for taxpayers involved in disputes with the Internal Revenue Service.

# House OKs law to combat medical waste dumping

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House, alarmed by used syringes and vials of AIDS-infected blood washing up on shorelines, joined the Senate on Thursday in approving legislation to combat the dumping of medical waste.

"The illegal disposal of medical waste is spreading like an epidemic across the country," said Rep. Thomas Luken, D-Ohio. "This waste is not just repulsive; it can literally kill people."

According to recent federal studies, as many as 18,000 people each year may contract hepatitis B from accidental contact with medical waste," he said.

The bill, approved 390-28, would

require the Environmental Protection Agency to set up a system to track infectious or dangerous trash from hospitals, labs and clinics.

The measure would require tracking in 10 states. They are Connecticut, New Jersey and the states bordering the Great Lakes: New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota.

The control program could become "national" in scope because any other state could petition EPA to have its medical waste subjected to the paper-trail system and gain authority to take enforcement action against incoming waste not meeting requirements.

# Army to review records of black heroes in WWI

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Army has agreed to review the records of black World War I heroes after an acknowledgment by Defense Secretary Frank Carlucci that racial discrimination "could well have extended to individual decisions leading to the awarding of medals," a lawmaker said Thursday.

Rep. Joseph DioGuardi, R-N.Y., made the disclosure in releasing letters from Carlucci and another Pentagon official.

DioGuardi and Rep. Mickey Leland, D-Texas, have been seeking posthumous Medals of Honor for two black servicemen: Army Sgt. Henry Johnson of Albany, N.Y., who served during World War I; and Navy Seaman Dorrie Miller, of Waco, Texas, who died in World War II.

The congressmen introduced legislation last October that would have waived the five-year statute of limitations governing the awarding of Medals of Honor, opening the way for consideration of the Miller and Johnson cases. But because of Pentagon objections, the bills stalled in the House Armed Services Committee.

DioGuardi and Leland, along with 102 colleagues, wrote to Carlucci in June, and the letter released Thursday was the secretary's reply.

It is clear that unjust discrimination existed during World Wars I and II that could well have extended to individual decisions leading to the awarding of medals in recognition of heroic actions," Carlucci wrote.

Carlucci emphasized that the Defense Department "does not support a symbolic award" of the Medal of Honor.

# EPA not acting on water violations, group says

WASHINGTON — More than 225,000 Idahoans and millions of people nationwide have been drinking polluted water from their taps because of the failure of state and federal authorities to enforce pollution laws, the nation's largest conservation group charged Thursday.

As a result, more than 40 million people drank water tainted with dis-

ease-causing bacteria; pesticides and other pollutants in fiscal year 1987, the National Wildlife Federation said in its state-by-state report, "Danger on Tap."

"Water suppliers that put their customers in jeopardy are operating with virtual impunity," said the Federation's president, Jay D. Hair.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and state agencies it delegates power to are responsible

for enforcing the 1974 Safe Drinking Water Act, which requires EPA to lay down monitoring rules and set drinking standards for water systems that have 15 or more service connections or serve at least 25 people.

Nationwide, the EPA and state agencies imposed fines or took other legal action on only 2.6 percent of the more than 100,000 violations of drinking water regulations in fiscal year 1987, the report said.

# Group threatens Beirut hostages

## Warns U.N. troops to remain out of Lebanese presidential problems

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Kidnappers holding two Americans threatened the hostages safety Thursday in vowing their anger over proposals to send U.N. troops to police Lebanon's stalled presidential elections.

The warning came in a typewritten statement in Arabic from the Revolutionary Justice Organization. The statement was delivered to the Beirut independent newspaper An-Nahar along with a Polaroid picture of U.S. hostage Joseph James Cicippio.

"We shall use all the cards to thwart these conspiracies, including the card of the safety of the hostages, which we shall make the backbone of our confrontation," the statement said.

The photograph showed Cicippio, 58, of Valley Forge, Pa., in a navy blue track suit with red stripes sitting on a blanket-covered bed. His hands were clasped in his lap and he was smiling at the camera, but he looked considerably thinner than in previous pictures released by his captors.

Cicippio was acting comptroller at the American University of Beirut when he was kidnapped on Sept. 12, 1986. Revolutionary Justice, believed linked to Iran, also claims to hold Edward Austin Tracy, 57, of Burlington, Vt., an author, who was kidnapped Oct. 21, 1986 in Moslem west Beirut.

The note came three days after another group, Islamic Jihad for the Liberation of Palestine, freed Mithileshwar Singh after 20 months of captivity. Singh, an Indian professor, is a legal resident of the United States.

Singh was kidnapped in Beirut with three American colleagues, who are still captives. A U.S. State Department team is debriefing Singh in Wiesbaden, West Germany, and an official close to the team said Singh was providing "a lot of raw information" that could be helpful in learning about Americans still held in Lebanon.

The official spoke on condition of anonymity. The Americans held with Singh are Jesse Turner, 41, a native of

Boise, Idaho; Alann Steen, 49, of Boston; and Robert Polhill, 54, of New York City.

Sixteen foreigners, including nine Americans, are missing in Lebanon and believed held hostage. The longest held is Terry Anderson, chief Middle East correspondent for The Associated Press, who was kidnapped March 16, 1985.

Thursday's statement from Cicippio's kidnappers denounced "the rude call for imperialist intervention under the slogan of internationalization by a colonial power whose black history is mothering our present tragedies."

This appeared to be a reference to France, which proposed this week dispatching a U.N. peacekeeping force to Beirut to oversee election of a new president in Lebanon, a former French colony.

Two rival Moslem and Christian governments emerged in Lebanon after Parliament failed to elect a new head of state to succeed President Amin Gemayel when his six-year term expired Sept. 22.

# Algeria deploys army to stop rioting

PARIS — The Algerian government declared a state of emergency and deployed the army in Algiers on Thursday to confront three days of street riots and looting by youths protesting high prices and economic austerity.

The outbreak, in which a number of government buildings were set afire, raised a serious challenge to President Chadli Bendjedid's government and his effort to liberalize the Algerian economy after years of tightly centralized socialism.

Reports from Algiers said the violence was the worst since student demonstrators were put down by riot police two years ago in the eastern Algerian city of Constantine. Despite a vow by the army to restore order, uncontrolled youths moved through the streets of downtown Algiers and set up barricades made of tires and vandalized automobiles. According to news agency reports, occa-

sional gunfire was heard near the headquarters of the ruling party, the National Liberation Front.

There were reports of a number of arrests and injuries Thursday night, but no official announcements.

The destruction was aimed particularly at government offices and symbols of wealth such as airline agencies and a nightclub. It seemed to grow out of anger among poor Algerians pinched hard in recent months by frozen salaries combined with inflation running at more than 15 percent a year and unemployment that has reached 40 percent in the capital, according to unofficial estimates. Sensing the discontent, Bendjedid said two weeks ago that officials and state-run businesses have not played their assigned roles in the liberalization policies he adopted as a way to meet Algeria's growing economic problems.

# Yugoslavia leaders ousted by crowds

NOVI SAD, Yugoslavia (AP) — Communist bosses of a Yugoslav province were ousted Thursday night while a stone-throwing crowd of 30,000 people assaulted their headquarters.

They had promised to resign earlier Thursday in the most dramatic development in three months of mass street protests over ethnic strife and economic crisis.

Several people were reported injured when the crowd outside party headquarters in Novi Sad, capital of Vojvodina province, surged toward lines of riot police, hurling stones that smashed windows in the building.

Belgrade radio quoted doctors as saying some people suffered bone fractures, but no figures were given. The protesters began to disperse after the leadership stepped down.

Removal of the provincial leadership could lead to wholesale changes in the national party and Yugoslavia's six republics.

Stipe Suvac, the national party chief, said Tuesday night there will be changes in the ruling Politburo and policy-making Central Committee at or before a Central Committee meeting scheduled for Oct. 17.

Tanjug, the official news agency, said the Vojvodina party committee voted 87-10 to dismiss the 15-member Politburo, the highest political body in the province. Two members remained in a meeting attended by 99 of the committee's 127 members.

Provincial party leader Milovan Sogorov said a 10-member provisional group would be established while new leaders were chosen for Vojvodina, a flat, fertile area that produces most of the nation's grain.

The provincial leadership promised to resign after meeting with Serbian party leaders in Belgrade, Tanjug reported.

Dozens of rallies of 1,000 to 2,000 demonstrators gathered in Novi Sad to press demands for new leadership. Tanjug estimated the total at 100,000, but an Associated Press reporter put the number at about 50,000 in midafternoon.

Protesters waved Yugoslav flags and shouted slogans against low wages and declining living standards.

## Dallas sues N.M. prison officials to get out of maximum security

SANTA FE, N.M. (AP) — Convicted Idaho game warden killer Claude Dallas is asking a federal judge in New Mexico to order prison officials there to release him from maximum-security confinement.

In a suit filed during the summer in U.S. District Court in Santa Fe, Dallas, 37, claims he has been the victim of a conspiracy led by Idaho Corrections Director Al Murphy and his assistant, Tim McNeese, to illegally keep him in maximum security.

"It doesn't exist," said Murphy on Thursday, referring to the alleged conspiracy. He said his agency has

had no contact with the other state prison systems after sending Dallas to them.

McNeese said an interstate agreement requires the receiving prison, not the sending state, to be responsible for prisoner classification. He said Idaho had nothing to do with the classification Dallas received in New Mexico.

Lance Churchill, the Boise attorney who won Dallas' acquittal on escape charges 13 months ago, said Dallas is awaiting a court date on his petition and is looking for an attorney in New Mexico to represent him.

Dallas was convicted in October 1982, of the 1981 slayings of Fish and Game officers Conley-Elms and Bill Pogue when they entered his high-desert trapping camp to investigate alleged poaching.

He was serving the first of three consecutive 10-year prison terms for the killings when he escaped from Idaho's main prison in March 1986. Dallas remained at large nearly 16 months before he was arrested the first time.

During his flight he was placed on the FBI's Ten Most Wanted list.

## County association head disputes Watkins claim

MOSCOW (AP) — The director of the Idaho Association of Counties is disputing a claim by 2nd District Republican congressional challenger Dame Watkins that the association's Public Lands Committee has voted to oppose the pending federal American Heritage Trust Act.

Watkins said the action by the committee refuted the claim of incumbent Democratic Congressman Richard Stallaings that the association has endorsed the bill.

"That is not true," Charles Holden said Thursday during the association's convention in Moscow.

What we had originally supported was the concept of the American Heritage Trust Act as it would bring funds back into the counties of Idaho for the development of recreational facilities ... but not specifically as

written into the bills as proposed," he said.

Holden said the unanimous vote by the association panel only refined that position to urge that at least some provisions in the pending bills be rewritten.

In an Aug. 19 letter to Stallaings, Holden said, "The Idaho Association of Counties is supportive of the American Heritage Trust Act ... and would like to ask for your support of these bills."

That letter did point out some concerns with the way such a trust plan would work.

Of specific concern to the Public Lands Committee this week, Holden said, was the distribution formula for the 70 percent of the trust fund money that is not directly allocated by the current plans to states and their political subdivisions.

## PUC says extra electricity won't last forever

BOISE (AP) — The Public Utilities Commission says the present surplus in electricity enjoyed by the state and region will not last forever.

"Utilities should emphasize conservation, giving conservation plans the same consideration as utilities give to building new generating plants," the PUC said.

It issued a proposed directive to utilities this week. Response may be filed until Nov. 1.

"The energy surplus we are currently enjoying will not last forever," said Commission President Joe Miller. "An aggressive conservation program may enable our state to avoid or at least postpone the need for costly and environmentally objectionable generating facilities."

The PUC has approved conservation programs in the past on a utility-by-utility basis. Approved were weatherization programs and rate structures designed to encourage conservation.

Last year the commission started a new investigation of the direction and scope of the conservation and weatherization programs for Idaho's electrical utilities.

The PUC says utilities should give conservation and demand management the same consideration given generating resources in planning.

"Every two years, each utility should submit a resource management report to the PUC. It should identify the current and future demand for its sources of electricity and its plan for meeting electrical demand for the next 20 years.

Each year, utilities will be required to submit a "specific aggressive" plan to identify and evaluate conservation possibilities. The proposal focuses on non-deferrable resources, those which would become lost opportunities because they could be too expensive or unavailable in the future.

## Boise may force men to allow women into club

BOISE (AP) — After hearing no word from the Arid Club on whether it will change its men-only policy, Boise City Council President Mike Wetherell has asked the city attorney to begin drafting an ordinance to force the club's hand.

"How many times can I say it? I would hope they would deal with it themselves," Wetherell said Wednesday.

He said a United States Supreme Court decision this year showed that private clubs are not exempt from anti-discrimination rules. If there is discrimination in private clubs in Boise, the city should pass an ordinance ending it, he said.

The Arid Club's membership includes many of the state's most prominent business and government leaders, including Gov. Cecil Andrus.

If enacted, a city ordinance likely would deny city licenses, such as liquor licenses, to clubs that discriminate. The Arid Club now holds a liquor license for its exclusive river-front clubhouse, so it would be forced to choose between its membership policy and its liquor license.

At a public hearing last month, Wetherell and other council members applauded Hillcrest Country Club, which told the council that it is changing its membership policies to allow women.

If the Arid Club would follow suit, an ordinance would be unnecessary, Wetherell said.

"By and large, they're the only remaining club in the city of Boise that fits the profile of the (Supreme Court) case," Wetherell said. "It's pretty straightforward, in my opinion."

The Supreme Court decision upheld a New York City law banning discrimination in clubs that have business purposes. Among the guidelines used were that employers paid for some memberships, people discussed business at the clubs and made business contacts and the clubs served meals.

# Iggy Pop on a 'clear' comeback after putting wild life behind

IRVINE, Calif. (AP) — At 41, veteran hard rocker Iggy Pop is on the comeback trail with what he feels is a clean head and more control of his music.

Pop left the music scene in 1982, disillusioned after a 14-year career. He resurfaced briefly with the 1986 album, "Blah Blah Blah."

"I realized the way I was approaching my life and work had become untenable," he said in a recent interview.

"I couldn't go on saying, 'Let's get a couple of grams of blow and write a song. Let's get stoned before the gig. Let's get stoned after the gig. I'm in town, where are the girls?'" he said.

"I was living the classic wild style and that was no longer working for me."

Pop said that lifestyle "crept up on me slowly for years and it was a lot of work to change my way of thinking. I'm not AA or anything. My ethic is that I work hard, do what I do under my own power and at the end of the day, like everybody else in the world, I do what I can get away with."

Pop, who performs Sunday at the University of California, Irvine, has just released the album "Instinct." Admitting it may be "too steaming, too overdrive," he nonetheless says he's proud that "it's me, it's honest."

## Country star will quit performing drug song

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Charlie Daniels says he has quit performing one of his biggest hits, "Long Haird Country Boy," for fear that it glamorizes drug and alcohol abuse.

The 1974 song talks about "getting stoned every morning and drunk every afternoon."

Daniels said in an interview Thursday the song was written in fun but he did not want to make it appear that the record was glorifying drinking and drug use.

"Times change and I decided to take it out of the show. It was the Christian thing to do," said the leader of the Charlie Daniels Band. The five-piece country-rock group is also known for "The Devil Went Down to Georgia," "Uncesay Rider" and "The South's Gonna Do It Again."

## U2 hopes concert film will show commitment

NEW YORK (AP) — U2 vocalist Bono, who says past live footage of his band seemed "like pornography to me," is hopeful the Grammy-winning Irish group's upcoming concert film captures its commitment to rock 'n' roll.

"There's a lot at stake for us. It's something almost sacred," the singer said about "U2 Rattle and Hum" in the November issue of Premiere magazine.

"It's what we do best," he said. "We've never really been able to make records. We're a live band and that's more important to me than the records."

Bono said "U2 Rattle and Hum" will show a side of him unknown to those who've never seen the band live. "Being on a stage is a special place, a place apart. It's where I reach down into myself and bring up stuff. ... There are times onstage where I completely lose myself."

U2 will release a double-album soundtrack to the film, which is directed by Phil Joanou.

## Prince Andrew dislikes separations from wife

LONDON (AP) — Prince Andrew said in a rare interview Thursday that the long separations that his job as a junior officer demands have been hard on his marriage.

"Before getting married I never bothered about going away because it was fun. But I think to be split from one's wife for so long cannot be good for the long-term relationship," Andrew told Press Association, the British domestic news agency.

Andrew, the Duke of York and a lieutenant aboard the HMS Edinburgh, was separated from his wife, Sarah, from June until mid-August when their first child was born and for another month until they met in Australia, where they are on an official visit. The interview was conducted in Sydney.

"I don't like it, full stop," he said of the separations, but added: "You just have to take it, otherwise the navy

could not exist."

Andrew, 28, married Sarah Ferguson in July 1986. They have a 2-month-old daughter, Beatrice. Andrew has been in the navy for nine years.

## Mistrial called in suit against singer Prince

CLEVELAND (AP) — A mistrial has been declared in a \$2.75 million suit filed against pop icon Prince by a TV cameraman who claims one of the singer's bodyguards roughed him up. In declaring the mistrial Wednesday,

Common Pleas Judge Frank J. Gorman admonished The (Cleveland) Plain Dealer for revealing that the cameraman, James R. Gates, had rejected a \$100,000 out-of-court settlement over the 1984 incident. Gorman said the story would prejudice the trial.

When Prince's lawyer Terrence J. Kennelly asked Gorman to declare the mistrial, Gates' lawyer, Jeffrey M. Embleton, said he would not object.

Prince offered testimony via videotape Tuesday. He is currently on tour to promote his "LoveSexy" album.

# Tests show singer James Brown was on PCP

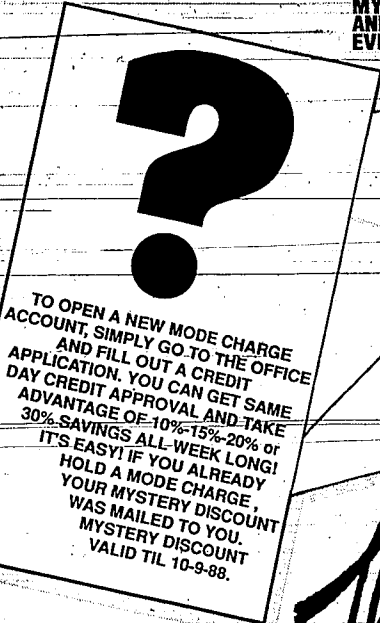

# Burley City Council considers extending airport runway

**BURLEY** — The Burley City Council listened to a proposal this week to lengthen a runway at Burley Municipal Airport.

Councilman David Gibbons said the Airport Committee will study what would need to be done to lengthen the runway and look at the possibility of a grant to help fund the project. The council gave no indication how it feels about the idea.

Burley Area Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Bill Schafer, in presenting the request to the council, said lengthening the runway could encourage business into the area. Many corporate jets, he said, require a runway of 4,600 feet, while the longest Burley runway is 4,100 feet.

"We'd just like to have a longer runway so corporate jets could land," Schafer said. "It's something that we

need." Mayor Ken Fronk said the city doesn't know how much such a project would cost or where funds would come from. He added, however, that even if grants are available most have to be matched by local funds.

In other matters, Schafer asked the council to consider allowing a souvenir and gift shop to be part of the Caboose — the city's information center. The council told Schafer to check with the Chamber of Commerce board for a recommendation on the idea.

The city owns the property and both but the Chamber handles the staffing.

Schafer told the council the Caboose will soon be without staff. Charlie and Eunice Patterson of Burley have run the center as volunteers, but will be retiring from the position

soon. Schafer said the Chamber has had no success finding a replacement other than Burley resident Steve Thompson, who has shown an interest in running the center if he can have a souvenir and gift shop there also.

"We at the Chamber feel that this is a windfall for us," Schafer said. He said Thompson would keep the stand open year-round, rather than just in the summer months as it currently operates. The information center is a benefit to our community," Schafer said. "It is the only way we are able to talk to the tourists as they come through."

In other action, the council approved a two-step process to notify people who will be required to repair or replace sidewalks in the spring. Those property owners will be notified this fall or winter that they will need to do the repair work in the

spring. They will be notified again in the spring when the work will have to be completed.

City Attorney Bill Parsons said the task might run more smoothly if property owners have advanced warning. "Voluntary compliance is a whole lot better" than having to enforce compliance, he said.

Steve Jensen of Burley asked the council for a response to a tort claim he filed in August against the city. Jensen said he suffered a loss of about \$1,500 in damages following a severe storm last summer. Jensen claims that inadequate drainage caused water and sewage to back up in his basement. Jensen said before he filed his suit, the city sent him a letter disclaiming responsibility for what they termed an "Act of God."

"I don't think sewage in a basement due to inadequate drainage is an 'Act of God,'" Jensen said.

Parsons said the city is allowed by law a period of 90 days after receiving a tort claim to determine the action they will take. "It isn't because anybody's ignoring it," he said.

The council also discussed the payment of \$750,000 as the city's share of the Washington Public Power Supply System settlement. The council approved the amount some time ago. Fronk said about one-third of the amount will come from surplus funds in the Electric Department budget. The remaining two-thirds will be borrowed from the Water Department reserve and General Fund.

The council has already decided to raise taxes to help replace the re-

serves being used to pay the settlement. Fronk said the largest raise in a homeowners taxes would be about \$30 for the year.

The council has not decided whether it will raise utility rates to help cover some of the costs. An engineer from CH2M Hill Company in Boise did a rate study recently and

suggested Burley raise the rates 10 percent.

In other business, the council:

- Approved payment for a garbage truck at \$71,852.
- Approved purchase of a computer at \$2,200.
- Approved a request by Recreation Director Ron Ploger to install new sod at Freedom Park for \$4,600.

Jeremy Bastian, 17, was taken to the Magic Valley Regional Medical Center where he was treated and released, said Harold Jensen, chief deputy of the Twin Falls County Sheriff's Office. Bastian was stabbed in his right thigh.

Jensen said authorities are treating the incident as an accident and no charges will be filed. The stabbing occurred around 9 a.m. at the boy's home east of Twin Falls.

**TWIN FALLS** — The Circle K Food Store on Washington Street South was temporarily evacuated Thursday morning after receiving a bomb threat, according to police reports.

No bomb was found. A caller, believed to be male, telephoned the store at 2:07 a.m. and said a bomb would go off there in 14 minutes, according to police reports.

**TWIN FALLS** — Residents who otherwise couldn't vote can catch a ride to the polls Nov. 8 with Randy Hansen Chevrolet.

"The people in the 6th Precinct have to go too far," said Richard West, a Randy Hansen salesman.

The company decided to offer the free rides because the county has no polling place within the 6th District boundaries. But van rides will be offered to anyone within the city who has trouble reaching a polling place.

Those wanting a ride should call the day before the election to help with scheduling, but calls will be accepted Nov. 8 from the time the polls open until an hour before they close. For more information call 733-3033.

# Cone's remarks in column infuriate Los Angeles Dodgers

LOS ANGELES — Pitcher David Cone, who had a spectacular season for the New York Mets, is trying his hand at sportswriting. One of his early efforts brought him a lot of attention, but probably not the kind he wanted.

Cone, writing a column for the New York Daily News during the National League playoffs, infuriated the Los Angeles Dodgers with his remarks after Tuesday night's opener, which the Mets won 3-2 by scoring three runs in the ninth inning.

The Dodgers took out their anger on Cone on Wednesday night, scoring five runs in the first two innings of the Mets' right-hander en route to a 6-3 victory over New York, evening best-of-seven series at one game apiece.

Cone wrote that Los Angeles reliever Jay Howell "reminded us of a high school pitcher

during the ninth inning Tuesday night. Cone also wrote that Dodgers' starter Orel Hershiser was lucky to have shut the Mets out for the first eight innings of the game.

Before Wednesday night's game, Dodgers catcher Rick Dempsey said Cone would pay for his words. And, as it turned out, Cone did pay, and dearly.

"Those are some pretty cocky statements for someone who hasn't been in baseball very long," Dempsey said. "You can tell that his success has gone to his mouth a little bit."

When asked why Cone would make such statements, Dempsey said "Stupidity. That's all."

"When you put your peers down like that, all you can do is create animosity," Dempsey said. "His day will come. He's gonna hit the ground pretty hard some day and nobody's going to be around to pick him up."

When asked if that might happen Wednesday night, Dempsey said, "I don't know. I hope so."

Cone never got the chance, because he was replaced by a pinch-hitter in the top of the third inning, before getting a chance to swing. It was his shortest outing as a starter this season.

Cone, in his second full season, was 20-3 with a 2.22 earned-run average, second to the Cardinals' Joe Magrane in the NL.

As soon as we got Orel out of the game, we knew we'd beat the Dodgers, even after Jay Howell had struck out the Joe (Mets) infielder Howard Johnson," Cone wrote. "We saw Howell throwing curveball after curveball and we were thinking: 'This is the Dodgers idea of a stopper?' Our idea is Randy (Myers), a guy who can really blow you away with his heat."

Seeing Howell and his curveball reminded us of a high school pitcher.

"I think it's as weak as it comes," Howell said of the column, which was posted on the Dodgers' clubhouse door. "I don't think that he's got any right to rub a win in our faces

like that. I don't think there's any call for that. No class. I think the comment speaks for itself. He should know better than to do that."

In his column, Cone demeaned Hershiser, who entered the playoffs with a 59-inning scoreless streak.

"Hershiser was lucky. Doc (Gooden) was good ... We knew about Orel's 59 zeroes, but none of us thought he was invincible. Shoot, Doc pitched a much better game. Trouble is, Orel was lucky for eight innings."

Cone said after Wednesday night's game that everything he said in the column "was meant in a facetious manner."

"For me to be little a fine pitcher like Jay Howell, who has been an all-star, is not right, and it wasn't meant like that," Cone said.

The comments were made after a very emotional game. I don't plan to hide. I plan to take total responsibility for it."

Jay Lucas, the Dodgers' assistant director of publicity, said the team received a copy-

of the article Wednesday morning from a fan in New York.

"We brought it to Dave Anderson, the player representative, Lucas said. "He decided he wanted some copies and would pass them out to the players."

"It got a little fired up," Anderson said. "We came out and scored five runs early. If that was the difference, that's great. It sure didn't hurt."

Several Dodgers agreed with Anderson.

"Cone's going to learn that you just don't say things like that," said Mickey Hatcher, whose two-run double highlighted the Dodgers' four-run second inning off Cone.

"He's got to learn to pitch with his arm and not with his mouth."

"We were fired up," said Steve Sax. "I think it gave us a little momentum, but that's what's great, he can write whatever he wants. I don't think guys were angry. I think they read it, put it aside, and said 'OK.' Maybe he learned something out of this."

# A's grab lead in playoff series with win over Red Sox

BOSTON — The Bash Brothers brought Oakland back. Then the little guys put the Athletics in charge of the American League playoffs.

Rookie Walt Weiss, the ninth-place hitter in a lineup of sluggers, singled home the tie-breaking run in the ninth inning Thursday night and the Athletics beat the Boston Red Sox 4-3 for a 2-0 lead in best-of-seven series.

"You knew it would be a dogfight coming into Fenway Park and facing Bruce Hurst and Roger Clemens," Weiss said. "But we can't let up now."

The Athletics headed home, where they have won 14 of their last 15 games, for Saturday night's Game 3, with Bob Welch facing Boston's Mike Boddicker.

"It's not over yet, but they know they haven't played us well in Oakland — hit well there," said manager Art Howe. "I'm humored for the second successive game and led Oakland's rally against Clemens. "At most, I see three games in Oakland."

All the A's, baseball's winningest team this year with 104 victories, are feeling awfully good. They were 54-27 at the Oakland Coliseum, sec-

ond-best home mark in the majors, including a 6-0 mark against the Red Sox. Overall, the Athletics beat Boston nine times in 12 games in the regular season.

The Red Sox, a 53-28 club at home, hoped to salvage a split and seemed in position to do it, taking a 2-0 lead into the seventh inning.

"We were up for this game and the way Roger was throwing the ball, I just knew he was going to shut them out," Boston manager Joe Morgan said. "I thought we were a shoo-in."

Instead, Canseco hit a two-run homer and Mark McGwire, Oakland's other Twin Tower, had an RBI single during a three-run rally in the seventh. Boston tied it 3-3 in its half of the inning on Rich Gedman's home run.

Relief ace Lee Smith and the Red Sox, however, could not stop the bottom part of the Oakland order. Ron Hassey singled with one out and took third on a two-run single by Tony Phillips, a 20th hitter.

## Twin Falls football team looks to better chances for playoffs

BOISE — "We've met our adversity now. We have to overcome it. It boils down to a matter of pride."

Twin Falls High football coach Jon Jund, trying to shake off some controversial calls he felt hurt his Bruins in a last-second loss to Meridian last week, feels he and his players have the rest of the season in perspective.

"Our players still feel they can make the playoffs. The cinch way to get there is to win our last three pot games. There is a possibility that if we could win two out of our last three and if we get some outside help, we might could sneak in for that third spot," Jund said.

All these possibilities come into sharper focus today when the Bruins' head capital cap homecoming with a 6 p.m. game in the Boise State's Bronco Stadium.

"Two teams will be all but mathematically eliminated this week," Jund said, returning to playoff talk. "If we beat Capital, they're pretty well out of it. The Meridian-Burnh loser is in trouble, based on past his-

tory that indicates a team needs three wins to move on to the playoffs out of the pod."

The Bruins are 4-2 for the season and #1 in the Class A-1 Division I playoff that also includes Capital, Borah, Boise, Meridian, Centennial, Lewiston and Coeur d'Alene. The Eagles are 4-2 and 3-2 in playoff contention.

Lewiston and Nampa are out and Coeur d'Alene is questionable now because they're the same as us with just three pot games and they had only one win against the Boise schools," the coach said.

But some signs this week buoy Jund's hopes for a strong second-half effort from the Bruins, now 4-2 overall and 1-1 in pod play.

"I think our team attitude and dedication are better now than they've been all year," the coach said. "Our players are looking forward to playing a Boise team in Bronco Stadium, they seem excited and determined."

The other thing, he noted with a smile, is the return of as many as five injured starters.

Halfback Lyle Hudelson may be back from a month-long ankle injury

and Mike Gose will bolster the defensive line along with Tom Fowers. Bob Jenco will return to cornerback after missing last week for school disciplinary reasons outside of football. And Jund elevated halfback Alan Heck to "questionable," noting the youngster sustained some upper arm muscle injury against Mountain Home, not a broken arm as earlier supposed.

"These five games make a lot of difference in our team from a depth standpoint," he said. "If we can get four of them back, we should be a healthy and near full strength as we've been since Centennial."

But he cautioned that Capital was a strong team that seems most capable in the area that Twin Falls' defense has been most inconsistent — passing.

"They throw the ball very, very well," Jund confirmed, concerning co-quarterbacks Kenny Boyle, 165 pounds, and Junior Rock Condie, 155 pounds. "They like to throw but they again have very capable running backs in Brian Pooley, 145, and Jim St. Mitchell, 180. They're not very big,

## Defending league champion Glens Ferry to host Valley

GLENS FERRY — Like a scoreless baseball game in the late innings, the Canyon Conference football race could be decided very quickly and in very dramatic fashion.

The first of those opportunities comes tonight when defending league champion Glens Ferry (3-2) hosts Valley, at 5-1 the hottest team in the league.

"There's no question this is a big one," said Glens Ferry Coach Bill Brock. "The winner will have no inside track the (state) A-3 playoff."

One-half game separates the top four teams in the seven-team conference with three weeks left in the season. Valley and Gooding share the top rung with 3-1 league records, while Glens Ferry and Wendell are

half step behind at 2-1. Two teams from the Canyon will go to the state A-3 playoffs.

That means that whichever of those teams comes out of this week-end with a second conference loss — Wendell hosts Filer and Gooding hosts Valley — will probably have a hard time getting back into the race for postseason.

Kickoff time is 7:30 p.m. at Glens Ferry's football field.

The wild card in the whole situation is that Glens Ferry still has a game remaining with Wendell and Gooding and Wendell will get together for the final game of the season.

But the remaining schedule definitely favors Valley, which will play a non-conference game against Wood River next week and wrap up its

schedule against Kimberly, which has yet to win a league contest.

"We've got to win this one," said Valley Coach Rod Malone, whose Vikings were picked by almost everyone to finish last in the Canyon Conference this year. "If we do and can beat Kimberly, we'll be in pretty good shape."

Valley's conference loss was to Gooding, which in turn lost to Glens Ferry. The Pilots' setback was to Decle, Wendell fell to Valley.

"A lot could still happen, but it's getting late," said Brock. "These are games you have to win."

"By the way, tonight — Glens Ferry will have to continue its trademark stingy defense while re-igniting its offense, which has run hot and cold this year.

"We did some good things at Decle (Glens Ferry's 18-13 loss two weeks ago), but we made some mistakes

that hurt us and we didn't play with consistency," said Brock. "That's what we've got to do against Valley — play with consistency."

Although this game will feature a showdown between Glens Ferry's star running back Jon Hartway (630 yards rushing in five games) and Valley's Nathan Huettig (555 yards in six games), the real matchup will be between the two best defenses in the conference. The Pilots have given up six touchdowns in five games, while the Vikings have shut out Oakley and Filer and allowed more than two touchdowns only once — in their 28-8 loss to Gooding.

"Glens Ferry presents us a problem because you can't get away with concentrating on Hartway," said Malone. "If you do, (Pilot) quarterback Duncan Farris will beat you."

"We're going to have to do the things we've been successful at, stop the big

plays and avoid the penalties," said Brock. "Our defense has played effectively all year and we've been a lot more consistent on defense."

Brock noted that Valley has been effective using Huettig's running to set up quarterback David Black and his favorite receiver, split end Brian Hardy, with which Malone agrees.

"Our offense is most effective when we can mix it up," he said. "But Glens Ferry is going to be tough to do that against. They've shut down teams that are bigger than we are and they like to stunt those linebackers."

"This matchup will also be between two of the quickest teams in the league — Hartway, for example, is a state-class sprinter — which not coincidentally is why they're two of the most successful teams in the conference this year.

TWIN FALLS — "I never realized what this family went through... trapped up in that attic — but this is real. This is really... These are the words of College of Southern Idaho sophomore Szaan Zimmerman as she prepares to undertake the starring role in the school's upcoming production of "The Diary of Anne Frank."

Zimmerman, who is not Jewish, has prepared to play the young Jewish girl by dying her blonde hair brown and studying the book by Miep Geis, the woman who helped hide the Franks from the Nazi armies during World War II. This is the second play in which Zimmerman, a drama major, has ever acted. The first was a CSI production of "The Rainmaker."

"These kids are very young to be as good as they are," said Tony Mannen, who has been teaching drama at the college for the past 14 years.

Mannen, who directs the school's two or three main stage shows each year, was the one who selected the play. "I have quality students who can do this kind of play," he said. "We had an extremely successful season last year, and 95 percent of those actors are back, in addition to some really good new recruits."

Another reason why Mannen chose this particular play, he said, is because of the recent television show about Geis and because he heard the woman interviewed on the "Today Show." He began thinking about how courageous she must be, even now, to speak out about having hidden the Franks. The script Mannen chose is the same one that won the Tony Award in the late '50s, he said. It also happens to be the first play in which he ever acted, as a 16-year-old high school student.

At the beginning of the play, the Frank family has emigrated to Amsterdam, where they are hidden in a one-room attic of the building in which Mr. Frank once had his business. Two of his employees, Mr. Krahler and Geis, have agreed to hide them. The play focuses on the events and pressures surrounding the eight members of two families who lived in that attic two years. It is a depiction of how the two families dealt with each other and formed relationships with each other over the space of time.

Mannen works hard to build trust among his actors, he explained, and he expects them to put forth 100 percent effort every day. His two work-study students even stay with him during the all-night work session when he designs a play's set. Around 120 hours of rehearsal time are required for each play presented.

Mannen does not, however, require his students to learn dialects for plays in which they perform. "You

can't squeeze 16 years of training into three months," he said. Still, he is extremely pleased with the talent among the students who audition for his plays. There are four drama majors performing in "Anne Frank."

"We have some really fine talent in the high schools here, too," said Mannen. But he added that he generally uses college students in these plays.

Most of Mannen's students remain in touch with him after they have graduated, he said, and many travel long distances to come back to CSI on play nights. One of Mannen's former students is now acting with the National Shakespearean Theater, and several of his past set designers are also with the company. But Mannen scoffs at the notion that all of his students must go on to play Broadway.

"I find it particularly successful when I have a student who simply becomes a productive citizen," he said. "Productive citizens. That is what we are really doing here."

## Performing comes easy to Roy Clark

JACKPOT — Roy Clark, when he isn't being silly on television's "Hee Haw," is regarded by most critics as a virtuoso of the guitar, mandolin, fiddle and banjo.

But now the jovial showman says he has a new endeavor.

Clark and his 11-member band are planning a good-will tour of the Soviet Union next month.

"We're calling it a friendship tour," he said last week during a performance stop in Jackpot. "We were there in 1976 and were told our music did a lot of good."

Looking weathered but trim in maroon tuxedo slacks and a white pinstriped shirt, Clark, 65, said he thinks of himself mainly as a comedian rather than a singer.

"I've been doing that longer than anything else," he said. "...I like to think of myself more as a humorist, sort of someone in the Will Rogers vein, that I see life as humorous."

Clark said on stage he tries to talk about funny things the audience can relate to, rather than telling "joke-jokes."

"I do situations that are just so obvious to most people that, if I can relate it and 'I' to them, they can see the humor in it," he said.

Kidding his bass player on stage, Clark said, "You should have gone to prison and learned a trade."

Trading an acoustic guitar for a 12-string electric guitar, he quipped, "I remember when we had kerosene guitars. The only problem was, every time you played fast, the pilot light blew out... But electricity is just a 'fad,' no matter what they tell you at the dam."

The Grand Ole Opry star sang songs he made popular, such as "Thank God and Greyhound You're Gone," "Yesterday When I was Young" and "Come Live With Me."

showed the country band's versatility. At a break in one song, charismatic Clark told his three fiddle players to "make me wanna dance," and he slapped his knees up to his hands in classic hee-haw style.

Shaking his forefinger and imitating Lawrence Welk, he told other band members, "Pee on your toes, boys."

When introducing a couple in the audience having their 25th wedding anniversary, Clark added, "And they have their 30-year old son, Clyde, with them."

And after some furious guitar-picking, Clark wiped his brow and said, "I'm not as fast as I used to be, but I'm more often."

In the Soviet Union, he said, the people love American country music, American jazz and American history of the West. And the crowds respond especially well to the banjo.

"They have fiddles and they've seen mandolins," Clark said. "They have guitars and all the other instruments, electric bass and drums, but a banjo to them is a very American instrument."

The Russian equivalent of a standing ovation is the rhythmic clapping of hands, he said, obviously quite familiar with the custom. Also, Clark recalled, hundreds of young Russian people brought flowers and candy to the stage "...so we KNEW that we were accepted."

The Hee Haw king's first tour of the Soviet Union was sponsored jointly by the American and Soviet governments: This time, the trip will be paid for by Roy Clark fans who, for a \$2 donation, sign a giant friendship greeting card and are each promised a post card from Moscow.

"People are just 'people' all over this world," Clark said. "The Russian people are like us. They want love and peace."

On Nov. 13, after a kickoff "gala night" hosted by Bob Hope, the friendship tour will take off for Moscow and Leningrad to perform six or seven shows in each city, returning home Nov. 30.

"We'll be representing the American people," said Clark, the musical ambassador. "We'll take that (greeting) card and show it on stage at every concert. And then hopefully when we leave, I'll present it to Mr. Gorbachev and they will display it permanently in a friendship house in Moscow."

With an instant warm smile pushing back his frizzy reddish hair, the 6-foot-tall Virginian said his goal is to spread smiles and help share a genuine love of people.

"We'll put a little American love on them (in Russia) and show them this is what America's all about," he said. "I believe in my heart that the problems of this world can be solved by the people of this world."

# Video industry expects record profits

"The bad news is that the networks' fall lineup will be delayed. (Pause) The good news is that the networks' fall lineup will be delayed."

which began last spring, was settled late in the summer, but the new fall season will not begin in earnest until late this month.  
Meanwhile, the home-video market is riding a wave of big hits. Just before Labor Day weekend, "Moonstruck," "Broadcast News" and "The Last Emperor" were released. "Cinderella," the 1950 Walt Disney animated classic, will be in the stores this week. And "E.T.," the biggest-grossing film of all time, will be out on video Oct. 27.

Million-plus revenues from its theatrical showings, would bring its gross total earnings close to the \$1 billion mark.  
To handle the crush, and to give the MCA folks some idea of how much overtime they will need to budget for their cassette-duplicating people, video stores across the land were authorized to start taking orders from customers several weeks ago. Although MCA is declining to release the current total, many video insiders feel confident the number will exceed \$ billion by the street date.  
Random calls to area video stores show that even the smallest of the corner-ma-and-pa stores tend to have 100 or more orders on hand.  
With everybody counting on being able to pick up their copy Oct. 27, there is some understandable anxiety over whether the precious cassettes can be physically delivered to all retailers on that fateful day.  
"Oh, we've got things under control, and we're psyched," says Craig Decatur, distribution center manager for Artec, the Vermont-based video distributor that will handle the bulk of the "E.T." cassettes in New England. "We'll work 16-hour days and make sure nobody gets it late."  
Those phenomenal numbers notwithstanding, it is not necessarily

clear that the home-video business will live happily ever after. Indeed, the massive hype attending "E.T." and "Cinderella" — together with the fact that both titles are priced to be purchased more than rented — has shifted attention away from some of the unresolved problems of this young industry.  
One of them is the so-called depth-of-copy issue: Although store owners live and die by the rental of hit movie titles, they can only afford to buy and stock a fixed number of them. For many small and medium-sized operations, that number may be as few as four or five. In the first few days and weeks of a hit release, that is not nearly enough to satisfy demand.  
A recent survey commissioned for the Video Software Dealers Association claims that customers have to hike to their neighborhood video store an average of three times before they find the title they are looking for in stock. Often the customer finds an alternative, but almost a third of the time he walks out empty-handed.  
In some parts of the country, major video labels and retailers are trying out a system called pay-per-transaction, in which the store owner merely rents the product and shares the rental revenue with the label.

Had Good one, Johnny! The line gets a pained, medium laugh from Doc and Ed and the studio audience and then quickly subsides.  
But in the offices of home-video executives across the land, the laughter — more of a satisfied, low chuckle — continues.  
While the strike reduced the networks to improvised schedules and played havoc with their new fall line-ups, further eroding their former dominance over the nation's leisure habits, the home video industry enjoyed its most prosperous summer ever.  
And, spurred by what are expected to become the two biggest-selling video titles in history — Steven Spielberg's "E.T. the Extra-Terrestrial" and Walt Disney's "Cinderella" — the fall video season, in the view of most industry people, will be one of unprecedented profits.  
"It certainly shapes up to be the best fall ever for this business, absolutely," crows Allen Caplan, the bullish owner of the 50-store Applause Video chain, based in the Midwest but rapidly expanding to other parts of the country. "The networks' troubles sure haven't hurt us any, and the writers' strike-creator confusion, and the public just can't take much more confusion. Let's put it this way — home video is now the channel of choice."  
The television writers' strike,

Other fall releases — either just out or soon to be out — that will feature video-store ledgers include "Frantic" with Harrison Ford, a digitally remastered version of the Beatles' 1967 film "Magical Mystery Tour" and "Beaujolais," starring Michael Keaton.  
Consider just "E.T." for a moment. The numbers are otherworldly. MCA, the video's corporate sponsor, has designed a promotional campaign that will cost \$25 million and that will bring posters and displays to 60,000 retail outlets across the country. TV commercials will show the diminutive alien himself in new footage shot for the occasion.  
The thinking is that a lot of people will want to own, rather than merely rent, this reverberant cultural artifact. Accordingly, the suggested retail price of "E.T." will be a very earthbound \$24.95. And, with a \$5 rebate plan from Pepsi (you have to buy some soda), the tab drops to 20 bucks. At that price, the moguls figure, some 10 million of us will buy. (Although reliable, up-to-the-minute stats are hard to come by the largest-selling video to date is considered to be "The Godfather" at 9.5 million units.) With the rebate figured in, "E.T." will perhaps take in \$200 million, which, together with its \$700

# Hanks and Fields try their luck at standup comedy

**HOLLYWOOD** — What makes a person funny? What drives someone to stand in front of a dark and smoke-filled hall, trying to fry laughter out of a sea of strange faces — which together have the power to send a comic home drunk on

It's like watching the highlights of a baseball game: Here's a guy who hit a home run. Here's a guy who slid into third. And the score was 7-3. You see none of the nuance of the game.

To direct the movie, Melnick and Field hired David Seltzer, who had written "Punchline" in 1979, only to watch it sit lifeless and gathering dust in Columbia's files. Development and production of "Punchline" survived three different Columbia administrations. The film originally was scheduled to premiere last Christmas, but Seltzer's desire to tinker with it further, combined with the latest change in Columbia's management from David Puttnam to Dawn Steel, delayed it.

Field and Hanks needed to learn the very difficult art of standup comedy. For Field, it was a struggle to make her housewife-character, and her stand-up routines, interesting.

For advice on stand-up comedy, Field turned to her friend Lily Tomlin, who told her flatly to get up on a stage. Field did, at a comedy club in Manhattan Beach, Calif. But the 45-minute routine turned into an audi-

ence question-and-answer session — as in: who are you dating? — with the film star.

Field then brought in two professional comics, Dottie Archibald and Susie Essman, to work up a routine for Lilah. As in the film, they hoped to draw on Lilah's life, but it was not easy. "No matter how you poke, punch or prod, it's boring," Field says of Lilah's appearance-and-lifestyle.

"But I had a feeling her comedy was sexually oriented." The end result is an uptight Jersey housewife who draws laughs by recounting her shock at the modern ways of love.

Hanks made an even more ambitious attempt to become a stand-up comic. David (Seltzer) had written stand-up comedy in the script, but it

sounded like it was out of a joke book and he had just put it there for the sense of it. It wasn't very funny," I said, "David, this stuff isn't funny." He said, "Yeah, I know, it came out of a joke book."

Both Seltzer and Hanks recognized that to make those scenes work, Hanks would have to go out to clubs and work-up his own material. With the help of comics Randy Feceter and Barry Sobel, Hanks went on the club circuit. In Los Angeles, he began to appear with some regularity at Ighy's Comedy Cabaret, the Comedy Store

and the Improv. "The first few times I was terrible," he recalls. "I thought I would have four or five minutes of material and I didn't. I had about a minute. The rest was all stammering."

While his material improved, Hanks still had moments when he stared at a sea of blank faces. "But there were also times when I destroyed them, just slayed them, and it came out of nowhere," he says. When they began production in New York, he continued to appear in Big Apple comedy clubs, often three or four times a week.

## Churches sponsor craft sale

**FILER** — In South America women weave thick sweaters and oversized rugs from alpaca wool. In the Philippines, craftsmen weave baskets from indigenous reeds and grasses. In Filer, bargain hunters snap up these imports at crafts prices for their homes and for gifts.

It's all part of "Self Help," a program sponsored by the Mennonite and Brethren Churches. Roger Robins, pastor of the Filer Mennonite Church, says the goal is to help people from third world countries to make a living from selling their handicrafts.

Last month, the Mennonites held a sale in Boise featuring an inventory of \$14,000 worth of imported items. On Oct. 13-15, the Filer church will stage a similar sale in its church basement. Organizers say they will offer for sale at least \$10,000 worth of items.

The sale begins on Thursday at 10 a.m. and continues until 8 p.m. Hours are the same for Oct. 14. But on Oct.

15, the sale opens at 10 a.m. and closes early at 6 p.m.

"This is not a fund-raiser for the church," Robins says. "We're not even reimbursed for the expenses of putting on the sale."

Volunteers, like Carol Schweitzer of Buhl, set up the craft displays and man the cash register. She says some of the items which will be featured next week include brass vases from India, carved wooden animals from Thailand and Africa, nativity scenes carved from olive wood that's found on the West Bank, as well as children's toys and Christmas ornaments from all over the world.

The prices are really reasonable because the work (marketing) is done by volunteers all across America," Schweitzer says.

According to a brochure, published by the Mennonite Central Committee, 40 to 60 percent of the proceeds from these sales is returned to the craftsmen who are struggling to escape poverty in more than 25 developing countries.

# Reba McEntire hits top of the charts with 5 gold records and a new album

Reba McEntire is on top of the country music world. After five gold records, a new album entitled "Reba" and a passel of awards, she just now may be hitting her stride. Fans are mentioning her first name in the same breath as Tammy, Loretta and Patsy.

Last year, McEntire received the Female Vocalist of the Year award from the Country Music Association — for the fourth consecutive year — surpassing the record set by living legends Tammy Wynette and Loretta Lynn, who had both won three years in a row. And when McEntire attends this year's CMA awards, airing Oct. 10 on CBS, she stands a good chance of winning Entertainer of the Year for the second time.

Many of McEntire's songs speak to women, but that has never limited her audience. "You know, I've found that when women like my music, men like it too." She has even received fan mail from men saying, "What do you mean this is women's music?" McEntire also has a large following of young people, who traditionally have not been fans of country music. "I don't like to be categorized," McEntire emphasizes. "I think the songs I sing appeal to everyone, and I believe that is a big part of my popularity." In fact, McEntire recently emerged in the top 10 of a

Gallup Poll of teens' favorite female singers, ahead of Cyndi Lauper and Stevie Nicks.

"My philosophy has always been the same," says McEntire. "I choose my own songs, and I look for the best ones I can find. If I like a song, it doesn't matter what style it is. Then, when I do an album or get my tour together, I listen to the songs over and over again. When there's one I don't get tired of, I know it's a good one."

McEntire grew up in Oklahoma, the daughter of a schoolteacher and a rancher. Both her father and her grandfather were world-champion steer ropers, and she traveled the rodeo barrel-racing circuit.

It was at a rodeo in 1975 that McEntire was discovered by a Nashville songwriter as she was singing the national anthem. She began her career singing traditional country music — when no one else was doing it. Today her repertoire still includes hardline country, but she has also moved into pop, even R&B. What has made McEntire a success is the depth and versatility of her voice. She moves from ballad to Western swing to pop standard with ease. And with her natural coloratura, some critics say McEntire should try singing opera.

Today, McEntire lives in Nashville, where she recently moved from Oklahoma. She has complete control of her career and has her entire operation under one roof. "Everything's right here in one building, management, booking, publicity, we even park the tour buses in here," she laughs.

McEntire isn't home much, however. Last year, she was on the road for almost 300 days. When not travelling, the hardest working woman in country music is in the recording studio. She's currently cutting her 16th album, due out at the first of the year. But after all the touring, recording, paperwork and awards ceremonies, what does McEntire do to relax? "Oh, I went shopping the other day and had a real good time," she says.

On The Cover Reba McEntire has been chosen Female Vocalist of the Year four consecutive years by the Country Music Association. This year, she has been nominated again, for both Female Vocalist of the Year and Entertainer of the Year. The 22nd Annual Country Music Association Awards air Monday, Oct. 10, on CBS.

# Soap 'As the World Turns' explores provocative and timely storylines

"As the World Turns" certainly comes up with storylines that are both provocative and timely. When Tom Hughes discovered about nine months ago that he was the father of a teen-aged Oriental daughter, the result of a liaison he'd had while stationed in Vietnam, it paved the way for still another area of exploration in the daytime drama world. Head writer Douglas Marland felt strongly that this situation would make for solid drama and he was right.

Marland and the producers were very concerned that they cast just the right person in the part of Lien, and they saw many young actresses before settling on lovely Ming-Na Wen.

Ming was appearing in an off-Broadway showcase production for new playwrights when she was seen by a scout from the ATWT production office. He had been alerted to look for young Oriental actresses and had seen Ming's name in the program. But when Ming made her entrance her character was disguised as a boy, and it wasn't until later in the play that she made it evident that she was indeed a girl.

Ming's love for acting began when she was still a young girl in Hong Kong. She remembers her mother talking about having sung small roles in the Peking Opera and always had a fascination with live performing. Ming recalls appearing on stage in a school play in Hong Kong when she was in the third grade, and that was enough to start her lifelong love affair with performing.

When Ming was seven, the family moved to the U.S., settling in Queens, N.Y. When she was 12, her family moved again, this time to Pittsburgh, Pa. where her mother opened a restaurant called The Chinatown Inn, which became successful.

Ming took ballet lessons, singing lessons and piano lessons. Her family encouraged her endeavors, but when it came time for college, they subtly hinted that it might be nice if she thought about a less precarious pro-

session than acting. Undaunted, Ming graduated with honors and a B.F.A. in Drama from Carnegie Mellon and set out to become a working actress.

Several commercials and some plays later, Ming joined the cast of "As the World Turns," creating the role of Lien, and no one is happier about her success than her family.

Ming says she likes it when people recognize her from the show, and she has been getting some interesting feedback from fans who have written her.

In her leaner days, as Ming tells it, she learned to be a frugal shopper and became quite adept at using discount coupons. On one recent visit to the supermarket, while Ming was on a check-out line she reached into her pocket for her coupons just as a fan recognized her and started telling her how much she enjoyed the show. Smiling and listening to the fan's praise, Ming quietly slipped the coupons back into her pocket. After all, a TV star doesn't use discount coupons, does she?

Ming wants always to project the right image. This attitude and her obvious talents will probably carry

# Meredith Baxter Birney drops glamour to play new role

Meredith Baxter Birney sheds all pretense of glamor this week to play Winnie Sprockett, who spent almost her entire life in a Kansas mental institution but never lost hope.

In a sepia-tinted introduction, "Winnie" begins in 1941 as the orphan rides in the back seat of a car across the Kansas plains to Middleton, the hospital that would become her home.

Wordless, the child turns huge eyes toward the woman who left her there — and who would raise Winnie's two sisters — as a nurse leads her down an empty hallway.

A series of quick stills shows the little girl in various sad stages of growing up there. That, Birney said, "brought tears to my eyes."

But Birney is quick to point out that "this isn't a tear-jerker" — although viewers may find certain scenes touching.

Rather, it is a story of a moderately mentally retarded woman who endures brutality at the institution, but who also finds friends there, who tries to make life easier for others and who takes great joy in her ability to read — she's fascinated by a book by Pearl S. Buck, for example — and in keeping a journal that she hopes will one day be published.

She also dreams of life outside and manages to persuade her boyfriend Thomas to run away and give the outside world a try. After a fairly delightful day — "I'm filled up with the beauty of the world," says Winnie — they spend the night in a car, then are returned to Middleton the next morning by a policeman. Winnie pays for her freedom by being placed in isolation by a sadistic matron.

Eventually, through the intercession of a counselor (Barbara Barrie), Winnie gets her chance to live "on the outside." It's a mixed blessing, she finds, with the wonders of libraries and restaurants and buses, but also with children who laugh at her and adults who won't give her a job, tell

her to "go back where you belong," and sometimes — in the case of a young man who gives her a ride — try to take advantage of her innocence.

To her friends in the institution, she explains, "You think it's all going to be peaches and beans, but it isn't." And to Barrie, she says, "I love the world — it's some of the people in it that troubles me."

After living in an institution, Winnie is both delighted and frustrated with the outside world, but concludes sadly, "I don't know where there's a good place for me in this world."

"I loved the character on the page," Birney said. "It was a joy to play her, once I knew and felt confident about how to present her. More than anything, we had to be responsible."

Responsibility to the mentally handicapped apparently was not a problem on the set. "Never have I been involved in something in which everyone seemed so dedicated to doing a good job," said Birney. "So many of the people who worked on the story had a retarded person in their lives or family, or had worked with them."

"Winnie" was filmed at a Veterans Administration hospital in Los Angeles, but Birney and co-star David Morse spent time researching their roles at two centers for the mentally retarded in the area.

Birney said she had planned to sit quietly and observe the residents but found instead that they — avid TV fans all — would turn from their almost continual TV-watching to wave and smile at the actors. They didn't seem to care much about why she and Morse were there, however. "They thought it was neat," she said, "but they never asked why."

What many did want, however, was to be in the film. Some got their wish.

Director John Korty used several of the residents in a party sequence that features a musical group, The High Hopes, whose members Birney described as mentally retarded but musically gifted.

"The first time I visited I was very quiet and shy and felt so guilty, be-

cause here I was, a whole person," said Birney. She came to realize that "there's something so very loving about them. I was very concerned about what they thought."

She said she worried that they would wonder why she was acting differently in "Winnie" than she did in NBC's "Family Ties," soon to begin its seventh and last season. As it turned out, she said, "they didn't think anything of it."

In a Halloween-party scene, Birney turns up wearing a rabbit costume, while Morse is dressed as a tomato. "I was standing there in this big bunny suit, and they came up and rubbed my nose and said, 'You don't look the way you do on "Family Ties."'"

So that she could draw information for her role, Birney was introduced to several women whose age and disability would have correlated to Winnie's.

"The women were so open, so non-judgmental. But they don't like being called retarded — they prefer 'handicapped' or 'disabled.' When they were asked why they thought they were here (at the institution), some had excuses, but one woman said, 'Because my brain is damaged.' And it hurt her to say that."

Fans of Meredith Baxter Birney may be surprised to find that the woman they know as pretty Elyse Keaton appears this week with lines etched into her face, shorter hair, a less than melodic voice and faulty teeth. The teeth, anyway, aren't entirely her own.

"There seems to be a correlation of mental disability and lack of dental hygiene," she said. "That's one of the reasons I used a small appliance in my mouth, to discolor the teeth and protrude them slightly."

The voice Birney uses in her role is jarring — nasal, harsh, unmodulated, and very much like the real Winnie's voice, she said. "I got the voice very, very close to Winnie's voice — but it was so shrill, if anything I had to take it down a bit," said Birney.

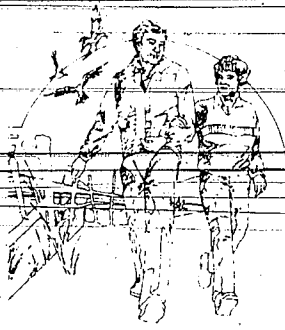

## Olympics top ratings, but cost NBC money

NEW YORK (AP) - NBC's coverage of the Summer Olympics dominated two weeks of prime time but concluded Sunday with an average rating below the guarantee NBC gave advertisers, and that will cost the network millions.

NBC, which paid more than \$300 million for the rights to the Olympics, won't comment on the loss, but the Wall Street Journal reported the network will have to give as much as \$70 million in commercial time to advertisers who didn't get as high a rating as they were promised.

The 16 nights of Olympics coverage from Sept. 1 - not counting the opening and closing ceremonies - averaged a 10.9 rating. NBC had promised advertisers 21.2. The 1984 summer games on ABC had averaged 23.2.

Each rating point represents 904,000 households with televisions.

NBC began giving advertisers free spots during the second week of the Olympics. A 30-second spot during

prime-time coverage cost \$330,000.

Nevertheless, six nights of Olympics coverage took up six places in the top 10 in the A.C. Nielsen ratings for the week ending Oct. 2 and gave NBC a decisive win for the week with a 17.5 rating to ABC's 12.3 and CBS'

11.2. "The actual performance by the Olympics in key groups (of viewers) was a really dominant performance. Whether it was as dominant as anticipated, that's something else," said Gerald Jaffe, NBC vice president for research projects.

He said NBC intended to research the reason for the low-rated performance, but would not likely make the results public. The time difference between the United States and Korea, the late September timing of the event and a general decline in network ratings are likely contributors.

CBS and ABC rebounded against the Olympics on Sunday when the closing ceremonies had a lowly 12.3.

## Olympics top ratings, but cost NBC money

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC's coverage of the Summer Olympics dominated two weeks of prime-time but concluded Sunday with an average rating below the guarantee NBC gave advertisers, and that will cost the network millions.

NBC, which paid more than \$300 million for the rights to the Olympics, won't comment on the loss, but the Wall Street Journal reported the network will have to give as much as \$70 million in commercial time to advertisers who didn't get as high a rating as they were promised.

The 15 nights of Olympics coverage from Seoul — not counting the opening and closing ceremonies — averaged a 17.9 rating. NBC had promised advertisers 21.2. The 1984 summer games on ABC had averaged 23.2.

Each rating point represents 904,000 households with televisions.

NBC began giving advertisers free spots during the second week of the Olympics. A 30-second spot during

prime-time coverage cost \$330,000.

Nevertheless, six nights of Olympics coverage took up six places in the top 10 in the A.C. Nielsen ratings for the week ending Oct. 2 and gave NBC a decisive win for the week with a 17.6 rating to ABC's 12.3 and CBS' 11.2.

"The actual performance by the Olympics in key groups (of viewers) was a really dominant performance. Whether it was as dominant as anticipated, that's something else," said Gerald Jaffe, NBC vice president for research projects.

He said NBC intended to research the reason for the low-rated performance, but would not likely make the results public. The time difference between the United States and Korea, the late September timing of the event and a general decline in network ratings are likely contributors.

CBS and ABC rebounded against the Olympics on Sunday when the closing ceremonies had a lowly 12.3.

## Syndicated reruns are often shortened for ads

**Q:** I've noticed syndicated reruns of "The A Team" with, apparently, scenes cut out or shortened. Why?

**A:** What you are seeing has become common industry practice when it comes to syndicated programs. In the case of "The A Team," the distributor (MCA) sends a station pre-edited episodes (about 90 seconds are deleted) that allows the station that much more time to insert commercials. There is one other way in which a program can be shortened, but it is not quite as noticeable to the viewer. That is the practice, particularly used with movies, in which a machine (Lexicon) actually speeds up the film ever so slightly, and thereby gives the station

those extra minutes of time for ads.

**Q:** Is the actor who plays the lighthouse keeper and father of Ursula on "One Life to Live" the same actor that played Lord Henry Leighton on the same show?

**A:** It may be the similar accents that caused some confusion. Lighthouse keeper Cornelius Blackwell was played by South African actor-playwright Athol Fugard (writer of such award-winning stage works as "Road to Mecca," "Master Harold and the Boys" and "The Blood Knot"). The Leighton character was portrayed by veteran British stage and film actor Donal Donnelly ("The Knack").
