Bush given edge over Dukakis in 2nd debate

George Bush and Michael S. Dukakis concluded their final presidential debate Thursday night by offering voters sharply different visions of America.

Bush defended the eight years of the Reagan presidency and Dukakis proclaimed, "We can do better."

But in what had been billed as perhaps Dukakis' last chance to draw even with his Republican rival — whom he trails in virtually every na-



tional poll — the Massachusetts governor failed to shake the vice president's composure, despite constant attacks on the man he called

"George."

An instant ABC News poll of 500 viewers rated Bush the debate winner, 49 percent to 31 percent for Dukakis. The network said its survey had a margin of error of 4 percent.

"Afterward, Bush himself said, 'I'm happy with the way it came out,' and his campaign chairman James A. Baker III, smiled. 'I really believe the vice president cleaned his clock,' Bush aides were noticeably more upbeat than they were af-

ter the first debate, which Dukakis was generally conceded to have narrowly won.

Equally predictably, Democrats gave the decision to Dukakis. 'I think it was a clear win for Mike Dukakis. I thought he did an excellent job,' said Sen. Albert Gore Jr. of Tennessee.

In 30 minutes of often-pointed rejoinders and personal asides, the two men clashed on everything from the qualifications of Bush's running mate, Dan Quayle, to Social Security, taxes, abortion and the death penalty.

Bush made it clear he wasn't going to give Dukakis another chance to tackle him face-to-face.

"I'm not going to have any more debates... We don't need any more debates," the vice president told panelist Andrea Mitchell when she asked if the candidates would agree to another televised encounter. "The American people are up to here with debates. Struggling to overcome Bush's

lead, Dukakis was on the attack through most of the evening. He repeatedly chided Bush's record as part of the Reagan administration, called his budget freeze proposal "an economic slipper" and dismissed the vice president's no-tax pledge as "not worth the paper it's written on."

Bush vigorously defended his selection of Quayle, although Dukakis repeatedly brought up the name of his embattled vice presidential choice.

Landmarks may win protection

TWIN FALLS — The City of Rocks and the Hagerman Fossil Beds appear likely to win federal recognition and protection this year, after a nearly year-old water rights dispute was resolved Thursday.

The Senate voted to approve new language late Thursday worked out by Sen. James McClure, R-Idaho, with several House Interior Committee members. Cincos are good the House will also approve the measure next week in the final days of the 1988 session, McClure said.

If the president then signs the legislation, Oakley's Silent City of Rocks will become a national reserve and the fossil beds will become a national monument.

The two bills were not expected to pass this year after Democrats in the House Interior Committee complained this spring that the measure that passed the Senate last year would set a precedent and limiting federal water rights.

"Because of repeated federal attempts to gain greater control over Idaho's water, I've insisted that any public lands bills for Idaho be absolutely neutral on this crucial issue — no greater federal

water right and no diminished state authority," McClure said. "I've also said that if there's a different way to write that kind of protection, then I would be open to suggestions."

The new language retains local control of water rights, except rights in the City of Rocks already attached to Forest Service land.

But it placates opponents who feared local control would set precedent in other places by recognizing the Hagerman site as unique and without water-related resources. At the City of Rocks, the federal government would have to file with the state of Idaho, just as anyone else would, if it seeks any additional water rights. The state would continue to manage the City of Rocks. "The result is that the words are a little different, but it gets the job done, and it breaks the logjam that has held up consideration of these bills," McClure says.

The City of Rocks proposal calls for creation of a 14,300-acre national reserve to showcase and protect the stone pinnacles jutting 60 stories high from the desert basins of the South Hills 40 miles south of Burley.

The rocks were described in the journals of Oregon Trail pioneers • See McCLURE on Page A2

Precinct 6 to cast votes at DAV hall

TWIN FALLS — A District Court judge has ordered the county to move Precinct 6's polling place back to the Disabled American Veterans building after commissioners agreed that was the best thing to do.

Commissioners presented Judge Daniel Meehl with a resolution Thursday asking him to immediately move the polling place from the Church of the Brethren back to where it has been for 30 years, minus one primary election.

"That despite certain inaccuracies in the legal action filed by Ulahwti, Precinct 6 Democratic chairwoman, which asked the court to order the polling place returned to the DAV hall, said Commissioner Judy Felton. Ulahwti, who maintained the new polling place was inconvenient to the elderly and poor, hailed the action as proof that in the United States, one or two people can make a difference.

"It shows that the system really does work, but you have to make it work," she said. "My sore feet only hurt a few days."

Ulahwti, Helen Adams, who claims no party affiliation, and a few of Adams' children collected nearly 300 signatures from precinct residents last week and presented them to the commissioners.

Precinct 6's polling place was changed from the DAV building, 469 Shoop Ave. to the Church of the Brethren, 401 Fifth St. West, early this year after a misunderstanding over insurance coverage.

Commissioners were unable to change the polling place without the court order because the deadline for moving polling places was Monday.

Ulahwti said she will contact commissioners and offer her help in notifying precinct voters of the change. Commissioners have said they will mail cards to all 735 registered voters in the precinct at a cost of between \$250 and \$300, said County Clerk Richard Pence.

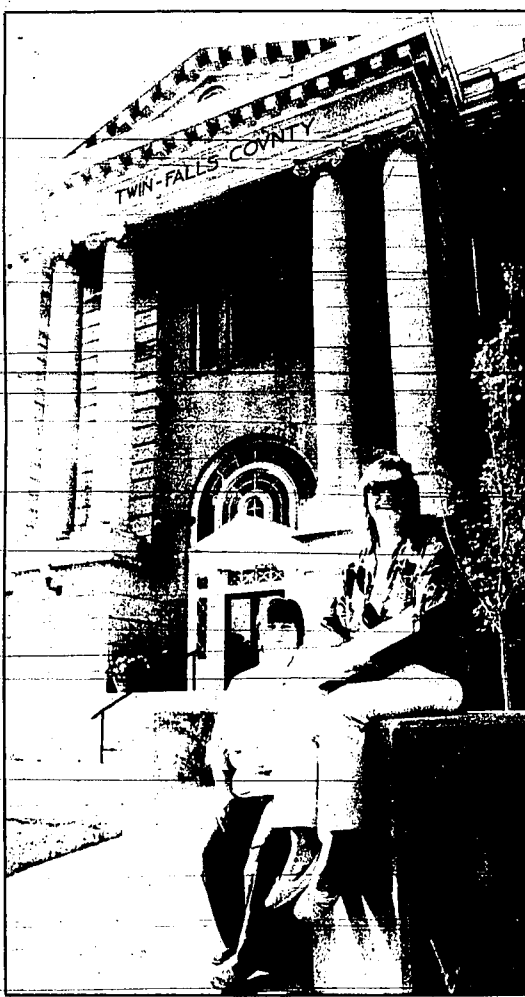
That expense — as well as the cost of mailing cards in the beginning of the year and the time wasted in battles with the commissioners — would have been avoided had county leaders bothered to find out for sure whether DAV officials wanted the polling place changed in the first place, Adams said.

"The commissioners — by not being in better control of the facts — have done themselves a disservice," Ulahwti said. "By not being better informed, I think it will affect them in the polls."

Don Overlin, adjutant of the DAV, said the group did not want the polling place changed and will welcome its return.

"It's too bad we had to go to the extremes that we did," Adams said. "Maybe now they'll know who they're

Senate reaffirms drug death penalty

WASHINGTON — The Senate reaffirmed its support of the death penalty for drug kingpins and hitmen Thursday, voting 64-25 against a move to replace it with a life sentence without parole in the pending anti-drug bill.

In a virtual replay of a 65-29 vote cast last June for capital punishment in drug-related killings, senators turned down an amendment by Sen. Mark Hatfield, R-Ore., that would have stripped the death penalty from the drug bill.

Hatfield's amendment called for a mandatory life sentence without any chance of parole for murderers committed in connection with illegal drug operations.

In an emotional debate, Hatfield argued that his proposal would be a stronger deterrent to "murderers than the death penalty without 'brutalizing' society in the process."

"The killing of a criminal who killed an innocent person serves only

to perpetuate a circle of hate and violence, ultimately cheapening the value of life and performing no function worthy of civilized government," Hatfield said. "For the murder of an innocent person the killer must be punished severely, and certainly life in prison accomplishes that in a most forceful way."

The Senate also approved, 88-0, an amendment that would empower the Justice Department to impose civil fines of up to \$10,000 on persons found to have in their possession small amounts of illegal drugs. U.S. attorneys would bring civil charges against users, who would be entitled to a hearing before an administrative judge. The judge would determine guilt, then set the size of the fine.

But unlike an earlier version passed by the House, a defendant could get a civil trial in a federal district court, where a prosecutor would have to use a higher standard of proof that the offense occurred beyond a reasonable doubt.

Nation's trade deficit hits \$12 billion in August

WASHINGTON — America's insatiable hunger for foreign goods — the trade deficit soaring to \$12.2 billion in August.

That is \$2.7 billion higher than July. Imports of foreign goods jumped 10 percent to a record high \$39.7 billion. Exports of U.S. products increased, too, but by only a modest 3.9 percent, to \$27.5 billion.

The dollar and bond prices fell sharply upon the

news, but stock prices rose modestly, with the Dow Jones average up 12 points at mid-day; stocks had already fallen 30.23 points Wednesday as sellers unloaded in anticipation of bad trade news, analysts said.

Americans imported \$3.7 billion more in foreign goods during August than in July. Of that, \$1.1 billion was for capital goods, \$1.1 billion for consumer goods, \$700 million for autos and parts, \$500 million for industrial supplies and the rest

bought food and beverages. America's trade imbalance worsened most in August with Japan, to \$4.8 billion, up from July's \$1.4 billion. It also increased slightly with Taiwan, OPEC and Brazil. The U.S. deficit with Western Europe narrowed to \$1.4 billion, down from \$2.3 billion in July.

Last October's stock market crash was triggered by a similar, though worse, report that the August 1987 trade deficit was a stunning \$15.7 billion.

Gem court upholds Hurlbutt's ruling in Swan Falls water case

BOISE — All individuals and organizations with Snake River Basin water rights must be included in massive court proceedings over those water rights, the Idaho Supreme Court says.

The court on Thursday voted 4-1 to uphold a ruling by 5th District Judge Daniel Hurlbutt. It denied a petition from irrigation

water districts in the Boise and Weiser River tributaries, seeking to get out of the Swan Falls water right proceedings.

The state has launched court proceedings to adjudicate Snake River water rights, a process which will involve hundreds of thousands of claims, cost more than \$20 million and take a decade to settle.

The Boise-Kuna, Nampa & Meridian, New York, Wilder, Big Bend and Weiser irrigation

districts asked Hurlbutt, of Twin Falls, to exempt them from the proceedings, because water rights in those districts already have been adjudicated, or decided by court proceedings.

But the Supreme Court, with Justice Stephen Bistline dissenting, declared that a federal law, the McCarran Amendment, requires all water users to be included if the federal government is to be part of the proceeding.

In an opinion written by Justice Byron Johnson, the majority concluded it was apparent the Legislature intended to operate under the McCarran Amendment. In any event, Johnson said the state could not let the federal government decide what areas should be included, because that would be an unconstitutional delegation of authority. Johnson said the history of the McCarran Amendment and its subsequent interpreta-

tion in federal courts make it clear that the rights of all claimants on the Snake and its tributaries in Idaho must be included, if the federal government is part of the proceedings.

Bistline said it was improper to take to court again issues which already have been decided.

Nuclear plant may not operate soon

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — The chairman of an Energy Department nuclear safety advisory committee says there are "questions" about whether a production reactor at the government's beleaguered Savannah River Plant can be brought back up by a Dec. 31 deadline.

Dr. John Ahearne, president of the Advisory Committee on Nuclear Reactor Safety, declined to say on Thursday whether an Energy Department could effectively deal with safety concerns at the Aiken, S.C., facility.

"That's one of the things we'll be reviewing," Ahearne said after the initial session of Idaho Falls hearings on the Savannah River and other issues.

The plant has been shut down since August after an unexplained power surge, and earlier this month a government report said management undermined safety and deviated from practices common to well-run nuclear plants. That report also acknowledged that numerous accidents had been covered up for over three decades.

With the shutdown of the N Reactor at Washington state's Hanford Nuclear Reservation, the Savannah River reactors were the only production suppliers for plutonium and tritium, materials needed for nuclear weapons production.

Ahearne said it was unclear if the Dec. 31 deadline was driven more by safety concerns or production pressure.

Stallings will not debate on Monday

POCATELLO (AP) — Democratic Congressman Richard Stallings has advised the Idaho League of Women Voters that he cannot make Monday night's scheduled debate with Republican challenger Dane Watkins.

The Stallings campaign notified the league on Thursday that Congress will remain in session until late next week, and it asked that the Pocatello debate be rescheduled. But Watkins aide Dave Pearson accused the two-term incumbent of trying to dodge the confrontation.

"We'll make every attempt to reschedule," insisted Stallings aide Gary Catron. "We have provided the league with a list of alternative dates. ... I'm sorry it's come to this, but first things first."

Earlier this week, Stallings raised the prospect that a new date would be needed for the debate, the only joint appearance by the two.

'Settlement Week' shows good results

BLACKFOOT (AP) — The first test of the Idaho State Bar Association's experiment in mediation of civil lawsuits has done what it was supposed to — start breaking the logjam of cases in the court system.

The first "Settlement Week" in the Pacific Northwest saw 45 of 91 civil cases in Bingham County settled out of court this week.

"We had 14 who settled on Monday before mediation even got started, and 19 more who settled that afternoon," 7th District Jge James Herndon said.

Sponsored by a committee headed by former Bar Association President Marcus Nye of Pocatello, the program involves a specially trained lawyer sitting down with both sides in a civil suit and trying to help them reach a mutually agreeable solution. The mediator has no authority to force an agreement.

Hospital modifies abortion policy

BOISE (AP) — St. Luke's Regional Medical Center, the target of anti-abortion protests in recent months, has declined to ban abortions in its facilities.

But President Ed Dahlberg said Thursday that effective immediately the hospital has restricted use of its resources for only those abortions that are medically required.

Dahlberg said the hospital resented being the target of protests when it does not perform abortions but only provides facilities to doctors performing them. But he also said the policy change was not prompted by the anti-abortion sentiment.

Caldwell teen-ager dies in rollover

CALDWELL (AP) — A Caldwell teen-ager was killed when the car he was driving rolled over on a gravel road about six miles southwest of Caldwell, Idaho State Police said.



U.S. hasn't made hostage deals, diplomat says

WASHINGTON (AP) — Iran has told the United States it is not interested in dealing with unauthorized individuals over the release of American hostages, a top diplomat said Thursday.

Assistant Secretary of State Richard Murphy said the Iranian message had been part of communications between the two countries conducted through Switzerland and other countries that have diplomatic ties to Iran.

The United States has not authorized any individuals to strike deals with Iran over the release of the hostages, held by pro-Iranian militants in Lebanon, he said.

"We have made sure through those same channels I referred to that the government of Iran has received that same message and they realize our position and they affirm they are not interested in dealing with private citizens and unauthorized individuals," Murphy said in testimony before the House Subcommittee on Europe and the Middle East.

communication took place.

Former Iranian President Abolhassan-Bani-Sadr said earlier this month that an emissary for Vice President George Bush had negotiated the release from Lebanon of Mithileshwar Singh, a U.S. resident from India. Secretary of State George Shultz last week denied that and other reports about negotiations with Iran.

Murphy said the United States has repeatedly made clear to Iran that the continued detention of Americans in Lebanon would preclude any improvement in relations between the two countries.

"There will be no deals made for their release," he said. "They must be returned forthwith."

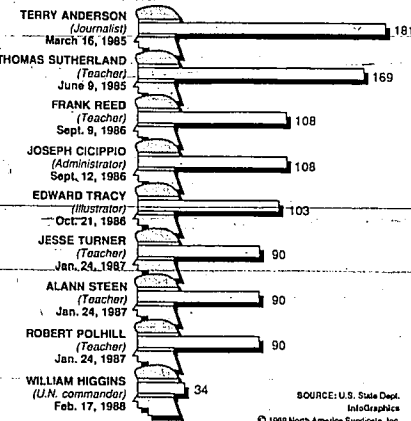
Asked about reports that the hostages may be held by Palestinian groups, Murphy said the United States did not have any evidence that the Americans are in the hands of anyone but Lebanese faithful of the Hezbollah, or Party of God.

Hezbollah is closely allied with Iran.

Reagan signs welfare-reform bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan signed Thursday the first major overhaul of the nation's welfare system since it was created in the Great Depression and said the new law is a "message of hope" to those mired in a life of dependency and destitution.

But that message to welfare recipients, said the president, also contains a demand from the citizens who pay the bills: "That you will do your share in taking responsibility for your life and for the lives of the children you bring into this world."

Reagan said the best part of the new welfare plan is that it actually poses "an alternative to life on welfare."

"For too long the federal government, with the best of intentions, has usurped the responsibility that appropriately lies with parents," Reagan said at the signing ceremony in the Rose Garden. "In so doing, it has reinforced dependency and separated welfare recipients from the mainstream of society."

The legislation contains the most sweeping revision of the nation's principal welfare program — Aid to Families with Dependent Children — since it was created in 1935.

Under the agreement reached after two years of legislative struggle, the government has pledged to provide training and support systems to destitute parents if they take steps to become independent.

U.S., Soviets sign AIDS research pact

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States and the Soviet Union signed a five-year agreement Thursday that calls for cooperative research programs to combat AIDS, drug abuse, alcoholism and polio.

Valentin Pokrovsky, president of the Soviet Academy of Medical Science and head of a five-member Soviet delegation, expressed hope that

the agreement will mark the beginning of a wonderful long road which we will travel together.

Signing for the United States at a brief ceremony at the National Academy of Sciences was Samuel O. Thier, president of the U.S. Institute of Medicine.

He said the talks leading up to the agreement were cordial and he pre-

dicted an "extremely pleasant" experience for both sides if the current atmosphere is maintained.

The initial plans call for several joint activities in 1989, including a symposium in the United States on AIDS research and a meeting in the Soviet Union on the health effects of radiation.

Banker says he managed Noriega's secret account

WASHINGTON (AP) — An international banker arrested by the U.S. Customs Service last week had told Congress earlier that he managed a \$20 million secret bank account for Panamanian ruler Manuel Antonio Noriega, according to Senate testimony made available Thursday.

The witness, Amjad Awan, an officer of the Bank of Credit and Commerce International (BCCI),

said the account was used to make cash payments to Panamanian politicians and to pay travel and credit card expenses for Noriega and his family.

Awan said he flew to Panama monthly to report to Noriega on the status of his account.

"I made an effort to cultivate him," Awan told investigators on Sept. 30 to a Senate Foreign Relations subcommittee.

Congress agrees on Iraq sanctions

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senior tax negotiators from the House and Senate reached agreement Thursday on legislation imposing limited economic sanctions against Iraq and seizing a portion of a historic battlefield in northern Virginia, aides said.

The amendments had been attached by the Senate to a miscellaneous tax bill, whose compromise version is being negotiated by House and Senate tax-writers. In both cases the House had approved similar provisions but not as part of the tax bill.

As dangerous as thalidomide

Study links acne drug, birth defects

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — The acne drug Accutane is as dangerous a cause of birth defects as thalidomide, causing 40 percent of women to miscarry and 25 percent to have children with severe birth defects if taken early in pregnancy, says a study reported Thursday.

Thalidomide, a sedative, caused an epidemic of birth defects in Europe in the late 1950s and early 1960s before it was withdrawn from the market.

Since Accutane was approved in the United States in late 1982, it has been linked to cases of miscarriage or birth defects in 25 states, said the author of the new study, Dr. Edward Lammer of the California Birth Defects Monitoring Program.

In a presentation in New Orleans at the annual meeting of the American Society of Human Genetics, Lammer reported that miscarriages occurred in 12 of 30 women studied, of 40 percent. Major birth defects occurred in 12 of 48 women studied, or 25 percent, he said.

These unusually high risks are comparable to those posed by the thalidomide exposure, Lammer said.

Neil Holtzman, a pediatrician and geneticist at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, said, "I don't think there's any doubt that it's a real danger." He agreed that the risks associated with thalidomide and Accutane — also called isotretinoin — are

comparable.

Dr. Moun Khoury, a birth defects specialist at the U.S. Centers for Disease Control, said that about 25 percent of women who used thalidomide during pregnancy had children with birth defects, making its risk comparable to that reported for Accutane.

Accutane, made by Hoffmann-La Roche of Nutley, N.J., is now marketed with strong warnings about the risk of birth defects, and women of child-bearing age must sign a consent form before it can be prescribed to them, said Paula Frakes, spokeswoman for Hoffmann-La Roche.

"I'm not sure the way the drug is prescribed now is sufficiently protective," Holtzman said.

Lammer said that in some European countries the distribution of the drug is sharply restricted. A proposal to restrict its distribution here was not adopted by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, Lammer said.

Frakes noted that additional requirements have been placed on doctors and patients when the drug is to be used in women of child-bearing age. The women must have a pregnancy test before taking the drug, for example, and must agree to use contraceptives, Frakes said. "The company has offered to pay for the pregnancy test and for counseling on contraceptive use."

House jurisdictional battle dooms passage of bank bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — Efforts in the House to pass broad-based legislation mixing the banking and securities industries collapsed Thursday, dooming chances for a bill this year.

A private meeting between House Speaker Jim Wright, D-Texas, and Democratic members of the Rules and Banking committees failed to resolve a knotty jurisdictional dispute that has been tying up the bill.

The Banking Committee, chaired by Rep. Bernard J. St. Germain, D-I., and the Energy and Commerce Committee, chaired by Rep. John Dingell, D-Mich., had passed competing versions of legislation that would permit subsidiaries of bank holding companies to underwrite some securities.

Wright has refused to mediate the dispute, telling St. Germain and Dingell they must work out their differences. On Wednesday, St. Germain told Wright that compromise efforts failed and sought his backing for a vote by the full House on the banking

panel's version of the bill.

Wright still declined to intervene, but agreed at Thursday's meeting to more specifically define which sections of a banking bill would be sent to Dingell next year.

"As a result of a meeting with the Democratic caucus of Banking and Rules committees with the speaker, it was determined it was too late in the session to report out a bill and that there was general agreement... that the bill would be addressed early in the next session," said Rep. Doug Barnard, D-Ga., a backer of the Banking Committee's bill.

Meanwhile, in the Senate, Banking Committee staff director Kenneth McLenn said a strategy by Chairman William Proxmire, D-Wis., to bypass the jurisdictional dispute in the House is all but dead.

Proxmire had hoped that re-passing his legislation and attaching it to an unrelated banking bill would have given his counterparts in the House a vehicle to circumvent Dingell.

Sudan allows U.S. aid start

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Sudan has agreed to let the United States provide relief to its famine-ravaged southern region, and food and medical supplies began moving Thursday to thousands of sick and starving people, the State Department said.

But there were no assurances that rebels fighting a guerrilla war with the government would allow the assistance to get through. They have attacked civilian planes and truck convoys, and interfered with the International Red Cross in its effort to work out relief schemes, spokesman Charles E. Redman said.

The airlift was begun after Sudanese Prime Minister Sadek el-Mahdi met in Khartoum with U.S. Ambassador G. Norman Anderson and Walter Hollinger, an official of the U.S. Agency for International Development.

Egyptian wins Nobel for literature

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) — Naguib Mahfouz of Egypt, an Arab storyteller who chronicled the search for human values from the Nile delta of the Pharaohs to the back alleys of modern Cairo, won the 1988 Nobel Prize for literature Thursday.

Mahfouz, the first Arab writer to win the award in its 87-year history, has been compared with Charles Dickens for his vivid portrayals of poverty.

One book of his was banned in Egypt and another attacked former President Nasser's domestic and pan-Arabist policies.

The Swedish Academy honored him for advancing the art of the novel, a relatively new genre in Arabic literature.

"His work speaks to us all," the academy said.

Mahfouz, 76, was awakened from an afternoon nap at his Cairo home and told the news. He said he was "very happy and thankful for the Arab world" and added:

"I congratulate the Egyptian people that one of its small people won a big award, (but) it's not too big for Egypt."

Soviets, Chinese might meet next year

BEIJING — Officials of Finland Thursday quoted Chinese leader Deng Xiaoping as saying that there may be a Sino-Soviet summit meeting next year, in a further sign that relations between Moscow and Beijing appear on the upswing.

According to the officials, Deng discussed the possibility of a summit meeting and the prospects for normalizing Sino-Soviet relations at a meeting with Finland's President Mauno Kivisto.

The official New China News Agency, in its report of the meeting, made no mention of any comments by Deng about a summit meeting. But it said that Deng told Kivisto that political and economic relations between China and the Soviet Union will never be what they were in the 1950s,

even after relations are normalized.

China and the Soviet Union, which were close allies in the 1950s, have been estranged since 1960. The last Sino-Soviet summit meeting was in 1959. Trade and cultural relations have improved in recent years, and a summit meeting would mark the full restoration of normal ties.

The New China News Agency reported that Deng said the normalization of Sino-Soviet relations will not harm interests of any other country.

Soviet Ministry officials who took part in the meeting with Deng, including Foreign Minister Kalevi Sorsa, quoted Deng as saying that if a scheduled visit to Moscow later this year by Chinese Foreign Minister Qian Qichen goes well, there might be a summit meeting next year.

It is not certain where such a meeting would

take place, but it is widely expected that Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev would come to Beijing for meetings with Deng, Communist Party General Secretary Zhao Ziyang and Premier Li Peng.

Immediately after the meeting with Deng, Foreign Minister Sorsa told reporters that Deng had said there would be a summit meeting next year. But Sorsa later corrected himself and said that Deng had told them there might be a summit meeting if Qian's trip is successful.

Li Jinhua, a spokeswoman for the Chinese Foreign Ministry, said at a news conference that the timing of a summit meeting "depends on whether the conditions are ripe or not" and added, "Now, I think, is the time for the creation of the conditions."

Yugoslavians ban street rallies

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (AP) — Authorities banned street rallies Thursday in the southern republic of Montenegro and the police chief of that area resigned after police used clubs and tear gas to break up anti-government protests.

In Belgrade, Communist Party leaders debated the legacy of late leader Josip Tito, who has been blamed for forming a decentralized government unable to deal with the country's worst economic crisis in four decades.

The weekend protests in Montenegro were the latest in almost daily rallies driven by hundreds of thousands of Serbs pressing for more control over Serbia's autonomous province of Kosovo.

The province's Slav minority, which is mainly Christian, allege harassment by the mainly Muslim ethnic Albanian majority.

Masada concert ends Israel's 40th anniversary

MASADA, Israel (AP) — Israel ended yearlong celebrations of its 40th year Thursday with a dramatic concert at the windswept foothills of Masada, where Jewish Zealots committed mass suicide rather than surrender to the Romans.

The festivities were marred by the 10-month Palestinian uprising in the occupied lands, which led to a 13 percent drop in tourism.

The damage from the point of view of image has also been enormous," said Micha Gidron, deputy director-general of Israel's Tourism Ministry.

He said it was hoped the concert would revitalize tourism and "return people's confidence in visiting Israel."

It will testify when we are dead that we did not perish through want but because, in keeping with our initial resolution, we chose death to slavery," Eleazar is said to have told his followers.

Zubin Mehta conducted the 120-member Israel Philharmonic Orchestra and a choir of 170 in performing Gustav Mahler's Second Symphony, known as the Resurrection.

Mehta said the music was chosen to symbolize the suffering and rebirth of the Jewish people.

Carlos Lazo of the Attorney General's Human Rights Department said a federal judge had been asked to issue warrants for the arrest of four soldiers implicated in the massacre Sept. 21.

According to residents of the village of San Francisco, 30 miles east of San Salvador, soldiers of the Jiboa battalion used grenades and gunfire to kill seven men and three women from the village who were suspected of collaborating with leftist guerrillas.

The army at first said the 10 dead were part of a guerrilla column.

Rotary engine inventor dies

LINDAU, West Germany (AP) — Felix Wankel, inventor of the rotary engine, has died at age 86.

Wankel died on Sunday, said Thomas Burkhardt, a close friend of the German inventor.

Wankel began work on a rotary engine in 1926 and began producing the new motor at the West German NSU Motor Works in 1957.

Through the years, Wankel also designed motors for the Japanese auto companies Mazda and Toyota, as well as engine superchargers.

Egyptian wins Nobel for literature

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) — Naguib Mahfouz of Egypt, an Arab storyteller who chronicled the search for human values in the Nile delta of the Pharaohs to the back alleys of modern Cairo, won the 1988 Nobel Prize for literature Thursday.

Mahfouz, the first Arab writer to win the award in its 87-year history, has been compared with Charles Dickens for his vivid portrayals of poverty.

One book of his was banned in Egypt and another attacked former President Nasser's domestic

and pan-Arabist policies.

The Swedish Academy honored him for advancing the art of the novel, a relatively new genre in Arabic literature.

"His work speaks to us all," the academy said.

Mahfouz, 76, was awakened from an afternoon nap at his Cairo home and told the news. He said he was "very happy and thankful for the Arab world" and added:

"I congratulate the Egyptian people that one of its small people won a big award, (but) it's not too big for Egypt."

Soviets, Chinese might meet next year

BEIJING — Officials of Finland Thursday quoted Chinese leader Deng Xiaoping as saying that there may be a Sino-Soviet summit meeting next year, in a further sign that relations between Moscow and Beijing appear on the upswing.

According to the officials, Deng discussed the possibility of a summit meeting and the prospects for normalizing Sino-Soviet relations at a meeting with Finland's President Mauno Koivisto.

The official New China News Agency, in its report of the meeting, made no mention of any comments by Deng about a summit meeting. But it said that Deng told Koivisto that political and economic relations between China and the Soviet Union will never be what they were in the 1950s,

even after relations are normalized.

China and the Soviet Union, which were close allies in the 1950s, have been estranged since 1960. The last Sino-Soviet summit meeting was in 1959. Trade and cultural relations have improved in recent years, and a summit meeting would mark the full restoration of normal ties.

The New China News Agency reported that Deng said the normalization of Sino-Soviet relations will not harm interests of any other country.

Several Finnish officials who took part in the meeting with Deng, including Foreign Minister Kalevi Sorsa, quoted Deng as saying that if a scheduled visit to Moscow later this year by Chinese Foreign Minister Qian Qichen goes well, there might be a summit meeting next year.

It is not certain where such a meeting would

take place, but it is widely expected that Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev would come to Beijing for meetings with Deng, Communist Party General Secretary Zhao Ziyang and Premier Li Peng.

Immediately after the meeting with Deng, Foreign Minister Sorsa told reporters that Deng had said there would be a summit meeting next year. But Sorsa later corrected himself and said that Deng had told them there might be a summit meeting if Qian's trip is successful.

Li Jinhua, a spokeswoman for the Chinese Foreign Ministry, said at a news conference that the timing of a summit meeting "depends on whether the conditions are ripe or not" and added, "Now, I think, is the time for the creation of the conditions."

Yugoslavians ban street rallies

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (AP) — Authorities banned street rallies Thursday in the southern republic of Montenegro and the police chief of that area resigned after police used clubs and tear gas to break-up anti-government protests.

In Belgrade, Communist Party leaders debated the legacy of late leader Josip Tito, who has been blamed for forming a decentralized government unable to deal with the

country's worst economic crisis in four decades.

The weekend protests in Montenegro were the latest in almost daily rallies driven by hundreds of thousands of Serbs pressing for more control over Serbia's autonomous province of Kosovo.

The province's Slav minority, which is mainly Christian, alleges harassment by the mainly Muslim ethnic Albanian majority.

Masada concert ends Israel's 40th anniversary

MASADA, Israel (AP) — Israel ended yearlong celebrations of its 40th year Thursday with a dramatic concert at the windswept foothills of Masada, where Jewish Zealots committed mass suicide rather than surrender to the Romans.

The festivities were marred by the 10 month Palestinian uprising in the occupied lands, which led to a 13 percent drop in tourism.

The damage from the point of view of image has also been enormous," said Micha Gidron, deputy director-general of Israel's Tourism Ministry.

He said it was hoped the concert would revitalize tourism and "return people's confidence in visiting Israel."

Yusef Yadin, son of the late archaeologist Yigal Yadin, who excavated Masada, opened the ceremonies reading from the final speech of Eleazar Ben Yair, commander of the 1,000 Jewish warriors and their families who stood off 15,000 Romans for

nearly two years.

Facing certain defeat, Eleazar called on the survivors to commit mass suicide and destroy the fortress at Masada, except for its food store.

It will testify when we are dead that we did not perish through want but because, in keeping with our initial resolution, we chose death to slavery," Eleazar is said to have told his followers.

Zubin Mehta conducted the 120-member Israel Philharmonic Orches-

tra and a choir of 170 in performing Gustav-Mahler's Second Symphony known as the "Resurrection."

Mehta said the music was chosen to symbolize the suffering and rebirth of the Jewish people.

The men first cut the throats of their wives and children. Then 10 men were chosen by lot to kill the other men.

More lots were drawn and one man killed his nine companions and then threw himself on the sword.

Salvador attorney general contradicts military, says army slayed 10 peasants

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador (AP) — The attorney general's office on Thursday contradicted the military and said army troops were responsible for the slayings of 10 peasants last month.

Carlos Lazo of the Attorney General's

office's Human Rights Department said a federal judge had been asked to issue warrants for the arrest of four soldiers implicated in the massacre Sept. 21.

According to residents of the village of San Francisco, 80 miles east of San Salvador, soldiers of the Jiboa battalion "used grenades and gunfire to kill seven men and three women from the village who were suspected of collaborating with leftist guerrillas."

The army at first said the 10 dead were part of a guerrilla column.

Rotary engine inventor dies

LINDAU, West Germany (AP) — Felix Wankel, inventor of the rotary engine, has died at age 86.

Wankel died on Sunday, said Thomas Burkhardt, a close friend of the German inventor.

Wankel began work on a rotary engine in 1926 and began producing the new motor at the West German NSU Motor Works in 1957.

Through the years, Wankel also designed motors for the Japanese auto companies Mazda and Toyota, as well as engine superchargers.

Wankel's research offices are in Lindau, on the shores of Lake Constance in southern West Germany.

Snake-eating stunt angers animal group

OGDEN, Utah (AP) — A snake-swallowing act by an Ogden man has come under fire from the Utah Humane Society, which says it may ask the state Legislature to outlaw the practice in the future.

Ron Stewart's reptile-gobbling performance came five months ago during the "What's the Craziest Thing You Would Do for a Motorcycle" contest. The competition was sponsored by the Pepsi-Cola Bottling Co. of Logan Ogden, KJQ Radio and Newgate Yamaha.

In its fall newsletter, the society denounced Stewart's act, which placed third. The contest was won by 21-year-old Jenise Merrill of Ogden, who covered herself in liquid cow manure and rolled in cornflakes.

"If they want to make idiots of themselves, that's their business,"

said Katharine Brant, the society's director of development. "But when it involves animals who can't defend themselves, that's when we step in."

The animal-protection group reported that the snake was eaten alive, but Stewart says the reptile actually was killed shortly before he ate it.

Roberta Dustin, owner of Magic Media Advertising, which launched the contest, indicated it is unlikely another snake-eating act will be allowed in any future contest.

"I feel like I've been crucified for this ... I'll lay down under a bus before I do this again," she said.

Dustin said she expected innocuous acts such as people strolling through the mall in a bathing suit or being hit by a pie.

Illinois students march against sexual attacks

MURBANA, Ill. (AP) — Hundreds of University of Illinois students held a candlelight march and rally to protest a series of sexual attacks on campus and the sexism that organizers said lies at the root of the problem.

"Sexism, making women sex objects, is closely tied to the degradation of women, which ultimately can lead to rape," said Laurel MacLaren, one of the students who put together Wednesday night's demonstration.

The rally was called to "raise the

awareness" of students to a string of 13 sexual attacks since April by what police have labeled a serial rapist.

About 500 students, most holding candles, took part in the march and the rally at the university's Urbana campus.

"I've been raped as many of the women on this campus have," student Jenny Keller said at the rally. "We're not asking for pity ... We're demanding respect ... for the strength it takes to go through this experience."

New Miami Beach law to protect Deco buildings from destruction

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP) — One Art Deco hotel is now in ruins, but the Miami Design Preservation League says no more Deco buildings will fall in Miami Beach's South Beach section.

"We know that we have had many successes in getting the world's attention for the Art Deco District,"

Nancy Liebman, the group's acting director, said shortly after the 39-year-old three-story Senator Hotel was razed Wednesday to clear the way for a parking lot.

"We are proud that we have changed the laws so that this can never happen again," she said.

Judge orders criminal to cook dinner

ANDERSON, Ind. (AP) — A cook has been ordered by a judge to prepare a Thanksgiving dinner for an indigent family of up to eight people.

Bonnie Kern, 28, pleaded guilty Sept. 19 to charges of forgery, theft and criminal conversion. Her sentence, by Madison Superior Court Judge Dennis Carroll, was in lieu of community service or a fine.

"You are to prepare and deliver, at your expense, Thanksgiving dinner for an indigent family of six to eight persons," Carroll said at sentencing Monday.

"I tried to think, 'What can she do that will contribute something back

to the community?' That seemed to be a logical thing, since she is a professional cook," he said.

Local legislative candidates discuss education, tourism and farm mediation at Thursday night forum

TWIN FALLS — Democrat Bill Chisholm talked philosophy and his opponent, Republican Larry Anderson, talked practicality. Republican Lee Barnes called for more money for tourism promotion, while his opponent, Democrat Virginia Ash, supported a private letter-writing campaign. Instead, Democrat Alvie Johnson and Republican Doug James found something to agree upon at a Thursday night political forum supporting the family farm.

James, the incumbent for House seat 23D, said he supported the 1987 Legislature's farmer mediation bill and would support a mediation bill again if it were "balanced and fair to both the farmer and the lender."

Johnson has made farm issues the focus of his campaign. At the Sawtooth Press Club forum, he said that he favored work at the state level for parity, supply management and a balance of trade.

But Barnes, running for House seat 21C, said farmers should be treated just like any other small business owner.

"As far as family farms, I would like to see them continue," he said. "But there are also problems with getting inbred. Any small business may have trouble by the time it's handed to the third generation; he said."

Tourism should be encouraged, he said. He'd double the budget of the Department of Commerce and then expect tourism to double too.

"It should be funded in such a manner that we could compete with surrounding states," he said.

But Ash said she didn't favor paid tourism promotions and would abolish the 2 percent tax on motel rooms to raise money for tourism promotions.

"It's not hospitable to have that sort of tax," she said. "We want them to spend money here. Then they enter our state and we want them to pay a tax to use the roads while they are here. It just doesn't seem very nice."

She recommended a grass roots letter-writing campaign to California newspapers describing the area's assets — the golf courses, the hot water springs, the opportunities offered by the College of Southern Idaho.

"You could fill up all the vacant houses in Pauli," she said.

Barnes and Ash also disagreed on school funding.

Ash would like more money spent for education and had a few ideas of where to look for it. She has been told the lottery has provided money for education in California, she said, contrary to what Idaho lottery opponents are saying. She would also raise more tax money by lifting the Investment Tax Credit, a 3 percent tax break on new business development.

She would not support more education money by raising property taxes, saying instead the entire sales tax has been designated since its inception for education.

Barnes countered that last year only \$264 million was raised in sales taxes and more that \$500 million was spent on education. That means that the sales tax would have to double to 10 cents on the dollar and then have to keep increasing a penny a year to keep up with education spending, he said.

Chisholm, running for the Magic Valley District Senate seat, joined several of the candidates in opposing a change in the school funding formula to encourage consolidation, when he was asked the question.

But that misses the point, he said. He would like to look at "restructuring and opening up the education system, then figure out the best way to pay for it."

The current system is too rigid, he said.

"We have a school system that is mandatory — there are exceptions with home schools and private — but children are all different with different talents and maturity rates," he said. "We should try to enhance with the input of the teacher and parents the God-given gifts of each child. ... Let curiosity drive the

thing."

"Serving in the Senate, you have specific problems and need specific solutions," countered Anderson. "It's a long, hard battle to get a small bill through."

But the small victories, like his work for more signs to help tourists, add up to better government, he said. Best trees have been refurbished at the entry points to the state, he said. He'd like to continue working on tourism programs, including adding rest areas at the Highway 93 and other major state entrances.

Like Chisholm, Anderson was dubious about encouraging consolidation by revising a funding formula that gives small schools more money per pupil than large schools.

"As a general concept, I disagree," he said. "I think consolidation will have to come about by compromise and long discussion. ... I don't think we should blackball small schools. I think we should legislators, like myself, who have all kinds of schools in our district would be put in an extremely awkward position."

FAA plans to discuss Hailey airport safety

"A variety of people in the Wood River Valley have expressed concerns over safety at Friedman Memorial Airport, and there appears to be contradictory opinions within the FAA on whether a new control tower is needed to enhance safety there," McClure said in a press release.

"I am pleased that the agency has agreed to hold this meeting, because I think it's important to meet face to face with local citizens and officials and hear their opinions directly before they decide on an appropriate course of action," he added.

TWIN FALLS — Curtis Eaton Jr. didn't know that his business, Twin Falls Bank & Trust, was being praised in a major national magazine until he heard about it from the media.

A special edition of Money magazine dealing with the best investments for the 1990s listed Twin Falls Bank & Trust among the country's 175 safest banks.

The magazine never directly contacted the bank. Its selections were based on information compiled by Verbanc, a Woburn, Mass., research firm that held up 14,000 banks to extremely stringent financial criteria; the article said.

"We're very pleased," said Eaton, president of the bank. "It is something that the employees, the community and the customers brought about (through) their support over the years."

"We tend to be a little more conservative in our investments and our loans too," he said.

Investment advice usually deals only with yield, Eaton said. The Money article is the first he has seen that has considered safety as a function of yield.

"You have to give up a little yield to get a lot of safety," the article states.

Financial institutions that offer interest rates significantly higher

than the going rate are often considered candidates for instability.

Eaton said the Bank and Trust has a higher percentage of agricultural loans than most other banks. What makes his bank strong while many agricultural banks across the country have been failing in recent years is diversity.

In other parts of the country, agriculture is more homogeneous, so if the crop is bad or the price goes through the floor, the banks are in trouble. The Magic Valley's crop diversity ensures a more stable farm income, and better security for banks, Eaton said.

The bank is owned by a group of mostly local private stockholders.

On Sept. 20 about 20 students broke into the high school and allegedly discharged fire extinguishers, tore down a bulletin board and left burn marks on carpet. Those students will each pay damages of \$38, Diehl said.

Federal court backs Stanley dude ranches

STANLEY — A federal appellate court has ruled that dude ranches may be developed in Idaho's Sawtooth National Recreation Area.

In a decision disclosed Thursday, the court affirmed that there are limitations on the effect of scenic easements in the SNRA.

The decision by the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals upholds the ruling of U.S. District Judge Marion Callister that Jack Furey of Challis and Fish and Game Commissioner Louis Racine of Pocatello still had dude ranch development rights

in spite of the scenic easement on their 203-acre tract in the Sawtooth Valley.

Furey said the decision sets the precedent for recognizing the necessity of structures such as lodges, barns, corrals and tack sheds for dude ranch operation.

While only three dude ranches currently exist in the valley, 25 other landowners from whom the government has purchased scenic easements have retained their dude-ranch rights under the ruling.

Furey and Racine, both attorneys, sued the government four years ago, claiming recreation area administrators misinterpreted the scenic easement deed purchased by the federal government on their ranch south of Stanley.

In finding in their favor, Callister agreed with Furey and Racine that the easement deed only sought to limit the number of permanent residences on the ranch, not the property's dude ranch right.

The scenic easement stipulated that only one residence and one tenant dwelling was allowed within the easement area. No mention was made of the property's dude ranch right.

Furey and Racine bought the ranch in 1979.

Mueller: Farm policy boosts chemical use

BOISE — Federal policy forcing Idaho farmers to grow more with less acreage is causing them to dump massive quantities of pesticides and fertilizers onto the soil, Idaho Rural-Council President Walt Mueller says.

"The chemical problem is affecting the food supply, and contaminating the groundwater," said Mueller, who farms near Twin Falls. "The continued high use of this stuff is going to ruin our water. It's absolutely uncalled for."

On Wednesday, the Idaho Rural Council joined forces with the National Toxics Campaign, the American Agriculture Movement Inc., the League of Rural Voters and others, saying federal farm policy has been a disaster for family farmers and has caused significant environmental damage.

The National Toxics Campaign, citing its report "Shadow on the Land," contends a farm policy controlling supply instead of acreage would increase farm income and decrease pesticide use by 20 percent.

Supply management would wipe out crop sur-

pluses in the United States, the group says, by setting quotas for each farm. If farmers wanted to grow more than their quota, they could sell surplus abroad.

Federal policy attempts to keep crop surpluses to a minimum by paying farmers not to plant fields. The policy has resulted in farmers receiving subsidies of \$27 billion a year.

David Bivens, Idaho Farm Bureau spokesman, said supply management ultimately would lead to increased food prices, one reason it has been rejected.

Three Dog Night to perform

The year was 1969. Elvis was back on the charts. The Beatles released Abbey Road at the height of the rumors that Paul was dead. And a half million music worshippers attended the Woodstock Music and Art Fair. It was a banner year for the music in-

dustry, each of which could harmonize with the others. With that Danny Hutton, Cory Wells and Chuck Negron formed the nucleus of what was to become one of the leading pop/rock groups of all time - Three Dog Night.

In less than six short months, the group would see their first certified million selling single, and before the year was over they would place a total of four songs on the charts. No small feat for any group, let alone a group that had played together for such a short period of time.

During a telephone interview last week, co-founder Cory Wells, explained what brought this group together. "Danny (founding member Danny Hutton) had just graduated from loading and unloading records at Disney Studios to recording as a solo artist; and I was touring with Sonny and Cher. After we became acquainted, Danny met Chuck Negron through mutual friends. We had no hangups about doing only our own music, so there was a whole smorgasbord of material to choose from. Independent songwriters were starving because it wasn't considered fashionable at that time for a rock band to record anything but their own material."

So, breaking with tradition, Three Dog Night recorded and performed the best

Exhibit recalls radio, TV pioneers

WASHINGTON (AP) — This news story can tell you age:

You're 50 or older if these words move you to memories of staring at a mahogany box and hearing:

— "That's funny, McGee."
— "Good evening, Mr. and Mrs. North America and all the ships at sea. Let's go to press!"
— "The house lights are being dimmed. In a moment, the great gold curtain will go up."
— "Hi-yoo, Silver, awaaaay!"

That, of course, was radio — radio in its prime time, the 1940s and 1950s, when every evening citizen would fall silent and a visitor strolling the tree-lined streets of middle America, on a summer's evening, could catch, without missing a beat, the 15-minute drama of Amos 'n' Andy pouring out of living room windows. In the Depression years, one-third of a nation tuned in.

A nostalgia-bathed exhibit opening last Friday at the Smithsonian Institution's National Portrait Gallery recalls the pioneers of radio and television and the programs that generations of Americans tuned in on and grew up with.

The show's curator is Amy Henderson, a historian of the 19th century who got her doctorate in Jefferson studies. She is a baby boomer, and, although she thinks she remembers "The Shadow" ("Who knows what evil lurks in the heart of man?"), her earliest firm memories are of television's Kuklapolitans and of the men in gas station attendants' uniforms who used to bring on Milton Berle.

"It is nostalgia to you," she told a visitor 10 years her senior. "But it's history to me."

Off and on for five years, Ms. Henderson scoured the closets of broadcasters for artifacts. She put the show together with help from New York's Museum of Broadcasting. It will run through Jan. 2.

The exhibit's museological purpose is not to wallow but "to trace the impact of radio and television personalities on American culture" from the turn of the century to the Kennedy-Nixon debate. The museum says the inventions of radio and television are about as important as Columbus' landing in the New World.

Visitors will watch television giving snippets of early broadcasts, such as Chet Huntley and David Brinkley, paired up for the first time to cover the 1956 political conventions. They stayed together to serve up the news for many years. Their sign-off — "Good night, Chet." "Good night, David." — became a national coda, recited in schoolyards.

There's familiar stuff here. A boyish Brinkley drily comments in a 1956 snippet, that the delegates did not clear the aisles when the chair asked them to clear the aisles. No doubt, he made the same observation this summer, eight pairs of conventions later.

— Dave Garroway is there, too, at the first "Today" show, with J. Fred Muggs, a chimpanzee who bit everyone. His palm upraised, Garroway signs off again saying "Peace." In 1952, television at 7 a.m. was a radical idea.

The exhibit offers artifacts of broadcasting: a Kate Smith gown, in a 1955 snippet, that the delegates did not clear the aisles when the chair asked them to clear the aisles. No doubt, he made the same observation this summer, eight pairs of conventions later.

Radio buffs get to see what they did not need to see — photographs of those who "widened their world. They get to see the device that created an awful racket when Eibber McGee reached for the door to the hall closet at 79 Wistful Vista, and millions of Americans, at their radios, tensed. What made that noise of a closetful of possessions falling atop Fibber was a chicken-wire covered barrel, churned by a sound effects man.

Fibber's wife, Molly, would respond, "That's funny, McGee," and people everywhere chuckled because it was funny.

As for those other catchlines of radio: — "Good evening, Mr. and Mrs. North America and all the ships at sea." That was Walter Winchell, the inventor of the gossip column, signing on for 15 minutes of frenzied chatter, his finger clattering a telegraph key between items, and hot news introduced with a barked "Flash!" Twenty million people tuned in.

— "The house lights are being dimmed." That would be Milton Cross, introducing the Metropolitan Opera to a nationwide audience, most members of whom probably never would see the inside of an opera house. His performance, every Saturday afternoon for 45 seasons, demonstrated the democratization of culture that radio made possible.

'Alien Nation' proves too thin to work

ALIEN NATION (R). An attempt to freshen up the formula cop-buddy picture with a futuristic allegory about the evils of discrimination is too thin to be effective. James Caan stars as a seasoned cop with some Archie Bunker attitudes directed toward humans from another planet who serve as symbols of any of the racial or ethnic minorities. Mandy Patinkin plays the first "Newcomer"—i.e., humanoid—to make detective and winds up as Caan's partner. Standard fare despite gimmickry. With Terence Stamp.

emerges from behind his tobacco chew as guileless, he is not without a deep melancholy, a twinge that hits all of them, even ebullient center fielder Nap Felsch (Charlie Sheen).

GORILLAS IN THE MIST (PG-13). With a sense of beauty and wonderment, this most unusual and challenging of African adventure films illuminates an extraordinary and unprecedented communication between a human being and the world's

change-ups unmercifully. The cheesy arena that writer-director David Seltzer has picked is the acrid, hostile world of stand-up comedy. Tom Hanks' range is enough to surprise even lovers of 'Big.' What might be overshadowed by the lights and darks of Hanks' character is the strength of Sally Field's performance, although her physical comedy is worthy of Lucille Ball.

SPELLBINDER (R). Director Janet Greek and stars Timothy Daley, portraying a nocturnal pickup going dangerously strange, give us a good half-hour of erotic tension before both the characters and the movie begin going to hell. Satanic symbols, ritual ceremonies, Lucifer on the loose, covens, corpses, Aleister Crowley in Calvin Kleins, endangered goats and virgins—The devil finds work for idle hands; couldn't he dream up something for the writers here?

TUCKER: THE MAN AND HIS DREAM (PG). Director Francis Coppola gathers you inside this glorious, warming movie about Preston Thomas Tucker (played by Jeff Bridges whose raffish energy never grows cloying) who came out of World War II with the dream of a revolutionary car. His innovations challenged Detroit, which effectively put him out of business. But the spectacle of Tucker brought low by the Detroit Big Three is not director Coppola's point; it is that he made his dream real; this is a film for rain-bow-riders, happy-enders, cockeyed optimists. In addition to Bridges—bravura—playing there is Martin Landau's meticulously shaded Abe Karatz and a brilliant cameo by Dean Stockwell as Howard Hughes.

WHO FRAMED ROGER RABBIT (PG). Dense, satisfying, feverishly inventive and a technical marvel, 'Who Framed Roger Rabbit' has Robert Zemeckis 'I' Back to the Fu-

ture') as its director and Richard Williams, an Academy Award winner for 'A Christmas Carol' (1972), as director of animation, under the joint banners of Disney's Touchstone and Steven Spielberg's Amblin companies. All hands and the artists involved may have created a film no one sees just once.

A wide variety of video cassettes awaits any movie enthusiast

The following are reviews of recent releases. Ratings: 4 stars — Excellent; 3 stars — Good; 2 stars — Fair; 1 star — Poor.

"War and Peace." Kultur. \$99.95. Four cassettes.

Given the recent popularity of film novels — "Brideshead Revisited" and "Berlin Alexanderplatz," it is surprising that the 1966-67 Soviet adaptation of Tolstoy's epic has taken so long to make it into video. The book is a tour-de-force of idealism, historical imagination and psychological drama as three upper-class protagonists — good-hearted Pierre, heroic prince Andrei and impetuous Natasha — move through an astonishing re-creation of Napoleon's invasions of Russia. The film, directed and co-written by Sergei Bondarчук, who also plays Pierre, also has its astonishing moments. The most elaborate Soviet production to date, it took the 1968 Foreign Film Oscar. Unfortunately, this video version, from the original American release, is cut and diminished. Its 307 minutes are slashed to 273, the wide-

screen frames are cropped and the actors dubbed. Be that as it may, when we get to Part III and to Bondarчук's furiously exciting, logistically staggering re-creations of the Battle of Borodino and the march into Moscow, the video redeems itself. Psychology, philosophy and poignancy may be somewhat muted in these cropped cassettes, but war in itself is thunderingly present. (3 stars).

Tasty videos set for cooler days ahead

When the weather gets colder, I start getting hungrier. Must be some sort of primitive, genetically programmed response. You know, like bears and squirrels when they get ready to hibernate. They start eating like crazy. I don't exactly hibernate during the winter, but that doesn't keep me away from the table. I just can't keep my mind off food.

That is why one of my recommended home video three-course feasts for this week spotlights food. (In the spring, I'll put together a column on exercise tapes, I promise.)

In the meantime, go out and rent "Tom Jones" (CBS-Fox 1963), "Eating Raoul" (CBS-Fox 1982) and "Heartburn" (Paramount 1986).

Directed by Tony Richardson, "Tom Jones" stars Albert Finney, Susanah York and Hugh Griffith. Not only did it win several Oscars, including best picture, best director and best screenplay, it also has one

of the sexiest eating scenes ever filmed. Once you have seen "Tom Jones," you will never gnaw on a roast joint of mutton without thinking of Albert Finney and Diane Cilento.

"Eating Raoul" is a strange little comedy directed by Paul Bartel, who also stars in it alongside the mysteriously beautiful Mary Woronov. They play a warped but loving couple whose greatest single desire is to open a restaurant. They wind up financing their dream by committing a series of rather grotesque murders. What has this got to do with food? Rent it and find out.

Based on the Nora Ephron best seller, "Heartburn" is about food, love, trust, marriage and betrayal. Directed by Mike Nichols, it stars Meryl Streep and Jack Nicholson. Suckard-Channing, Richard Masur, Catherine O'Hara and Miles-Foreman perform admirably in supporting roles.

"Heartburn" opened to mixed reviews, perhaps because people ex-

pected it to be some sort of modern domestic comedy and were shocked by Nicholson's performance as the heartlessly unfaithful husband. "Heartburn" is an excellent piece of film making and there is plenty of food in it, but it is most certainly not a comedy.

"Heartburn" also has a wedding in it and because there is always a lot of food at weddings, movies featuring marriage ceremonies seemed like the next logical genre to assemble. So slip into your tux or wedding gown, uncork a bottle of bubbly, put your feet up and watch: "Goodbye Columbus" (Paramount 1983), "Lovers and Other Strangers" (CBS-Fox 1979), "Father of the Bride" (MGM-UA 1950), and "The Godfather" (Paramount 1972).

If you have never seen "Lover and Other Strangers," you owe yourself this treat. Starring Gig Young, Beatrice Arthur, Ame Jackson, Richard Castellano, Bob Dinsy and a slew of other fine character actors, it is a perfectly convoluted tale about pre-wedding anxiety, post-marital itches and "swinging single" silliness.

"This is America, Charlie Brown" is first animated miniseries produced

Good grief, Charlie Brown, what are you doing landing at Plymouth Rock? And what's Lucy doing complaining about the conditions on the Mayflower?

It's all part of CBS's "This Is America, Charlie Brown" the first animated miniseries, which recounts events in American history from the Mayflower voyage to a NASA space flight. The first four half-hour segments will air on Fridays, beginning Oct. 21. The final four segments will air later in the season.

Executive producer Lee Mendelson, who has worked on every Peanuts TV special, spent two years researching and developing this one. "Five years ago (Peanuts creator) Charles Schulz did a show called 'What Have We Learned, Charlie Brown?' where the kids went to Normandy," Mendelson explains. "That led to the idea of doing a series of shows based on history. And no one had ever done an animated miniseries, so it seemed very exciting."

"We'd done all the holiday shows," he continues, "and there was a certain sameness to it all. So if this works, it will be a milestone for Charlie Brown and for television, too. It could also spark a real interest in American history among kids."

Selecting the events to include proved difficult. "The main thrust

was to keep it upbeat and positive, but we did cover slavery and the Civil War," Mendelson says. "We also tried to use the characters for the most appropriate events. Lucy, for example, was a natural for a space station commander. And one of the reasons this whole thing worked so well was that Charlie Brown is a character who always falls but continues to fight. A lot of the leaders of this country were the same way."

Doing the research also proved to be more complicated than Mendelson anticipated. "We went all over to do research — to Plymouth Rock, to the Bicentennial Commission, anywhere that would help make it accurate," he says. "We went through dozens of books, it was like panning for gold. Sometimes you'd find one book that told you everything, sometimes it took 40 books."

The special will prove informative to adults as well as children, as Mendelson found out. "The stuff we didn't know!" he says. "We didn't know that half the Pilgrims had died in the New World or that the Constitution was written in four-and-a-half months, which was a miracle. We all learn some of this stuff in school, but it slips away."

Although Mendelson is called the executive producer, he dismisses the

title by saying he just has "more of a title" than some of the other participants. "We all did everything, we were in this together," he insists. "Everyone helped on everything from developing the story lines to casting the children so their voices matched those in the original specials. It was a huge amount of work, but it was terribly exciting."

If Mendelson's determination is still in question, about half way through the interview, he said politely, "Would you mind if I called you back? I think the restaurant I'm in is on fire." He called back in a few moments to apologize. "It wasn't the restaurant, just the kitchen," he explained. "But everything is OK. Now about the problems of developing this miniseries ..."

Charlie Brown couldn't have tried any harder.

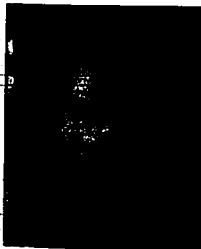
Q. Despite being a big film star, does Christopher Reeve ever get the urge to go on the stage? - B.E.

One of the charms of "General Hospital" is that it has always shown a fondness for seasoned performers such as George Gaynes, Anne Jeffreys and June Lockhart. Now Linda Cristal has been added to the list.

You may remember Linda Cristal from NBC's hit Western series "The High Chaparral," or maybe from her movies with Charles Bronson, Jimmy Stewart or John Wayne during the '50s and early '60s. She is currently being seen in the afternoon soap "General Hospital" in the role of Victor's lady, Dimitra.

"Dimitra is more trusting than I am," declares the beautiful Linda. "And she's capable of loving a man as much as her children. However, we part company on clothes. I don't dress up but she's done up all the time."

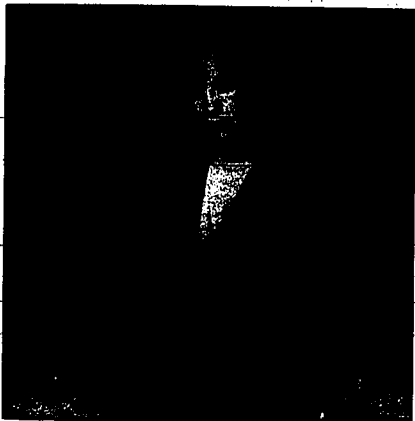
Linda Cristal, a Hollywood dropout who once turned to real estate and the garment business, is back before the cameras because she misses the excitement of performing. Once it's in the blood, it never stays buried for long.

"I wondered if I could do it again," Linda confessed. First she hired a publicist and then got herself a decent agent. Linda auditioned and became Dimitra.

"It's a lot of work, this soap business. Not a lot of images, but plenty of talk. That means you have to shake the memory up. It's a muscle, and I have it going again."

The story of Linda's life rivals any soap opera plot known to man. As a little girl growing up in Argentina, she lived in a rat-infested hovel where her terrified parents refused to let Linda go outside. Her parents practiced mysticism and tried to use it to cure her brother's tuberculosis, but he died at nine. Five years later her parents committed suicide and Linda was shipped off to Spain to live with her aunts in a convent.

Luckily for Linda, the ship made it only to Vera Cruz, Mexico, and she eluded her chaperones: She found her way to Mexico City, lived in the streets and collected coins which she

hid in her clothes. One day she was spotted outside a film studio, a place that lived in her childhood fantasies. Her stunning beauty soon was up there on the screen, mostly in cowboy movies.

United Artists then signed the Argentinian actress for the movie "Comanche." When Linda arrived in Hollywood she spoke almost no English and had to read her lines phonetically. Somehow she managed to get away with it.

Marriage, divorce, more Westerns and TV's "High Chaparral" followed. But one day the job offers stopped coming. Shrewd Linda enrolled in a business course at Beverly Hills High night school.

"I sold real estate and made sweaters on the side," Linda recalls. "My sweater was the American flag in different designs and it was a huge success in Japan and South America."

Schooled to consider each day a time for new opportunities and won-

Ratings for Cosby opener drop 19 percent

WASHINGTON — Dare we, after a single night on the air, suggest the following portends a trend?

"The Cosby Show" returned to NBC for its fifth season Thursday night with a 24.2 national Nielsen rating and a 40 percent audience share. Each rating point represents 904,000 TV homes.

That's down 19 percent from last year's opening-night performance of 31.5-51 (as a couple of rival networks were shockingly quick to point out Friday afternoon).

NBC professed no particular surprise in the drop after the immense popularity of the series in the past four years and Cosby's debut this week in syndication all across the country. In fact, NBC has been predicting a 40 share for Bill this coming season — down from last year's 44 and off the high of 53 of a couple of years ago.

An NBC spokesman also suggested that because of the writers' strike this summer, which ruled out a

single, late-September premiere week in which all three networks could come out of the starting gate, "viewers aren't always aware when the new shows are going to show up" — despite the intensive network promos.

Is this also a trend? The NBC lineup Thursday also included the return of "A Different World," which did a 22.7-36 — down 28 percent from the 31.3 — 49 for its premiere week a year ago.

NBC that night also "previewed" "Dear John," which registered a 19.8-31 (and which won't show up in its regular Thursday timeslot of 9:30 for another couple of weeks).

The 90-minute "Tonight Show" anniversary special that followed did an 18.1-30 ... as NBC still managed to steamroller the competition with a 20.3-33 between 8 and 11 p.m., compared with a 14.3-24 for ABC, which aired the pre-game blabber and the Bosox-Athletics playoff (which did a 14.9-25 from 8:20 to 11:34, during the game itself). CBS, with "48 Hours" at 8.8-14 and the movie "Leap of Faith" at 12.0-20, averaged a 10.9-18.

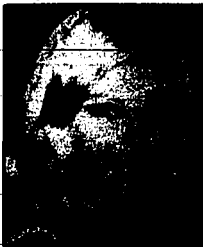

'Hardy Boys Mysteries' may return in reruns

Q: "I heard there used to be a series of 'Hardy Boys Mysteries.' Is there any chance it can be rerun on TV?"

A: The 1977-79 series starring Shaun Cassidy and Parker Stevenson is not in syndication at this time, although its popularity in previous runs would suggest that it will be back in the not too distant future (it is sold as a package along with Pamela Sue Martin's "The Nancy Drew Mysteries"). And "Talkback" has received some letters asking about "The New Hardy Boys," a projected series for NBC this season. Originally, this new version (using old scripts) was planned as a substitute series had the writers' strike continued. Fortunately (or unfortunately depending on your reaction to the new shows), the strike

ended and NBC canceled its plans to resurrect the "Hardy Boys."

Q: "Whatever happened to CBS' 'Tour of Duty'? Is it coming back?"

A: Yes it is, but you and the many other readers who have asked the same question will have to wait a little longer. Its delay is a result of the lengthy writers' strike. The series about combat troops in Vietnam resumed production Oct. 10 and it is the only returning CBS series that has yet to be given an air date this fall. However, a spokesman for the network suggested "Tour of Duty," which stars Terence Knox as Sgt. Zeke Anderson, probably will begin in late December or, more likely, in early January. Incidentally, the new season's episodes will be filmed in the Los Angeles area instead of Hawaii.

Michael Caine makes American TV debut

LONDON (AP) — Michael Caine, in period costume of long sideburns and tweed coat, settles into a Victorian chair in the quiet drawing room of the 18th-century mansion.

It's an appropriately chilly, rainy London day. But the next room is blazing bright under the quite 20th-century lights of the movie company filming CBS' "Jack the Ripper."

The two-part miniseries, airing Friday and Sunday, Oct. 21 and 23, marks the centennial of the grisly, unsolved serial killings. Writer-director David Wickes used Scotland Yard files that had been sealed for a century to develop a theory of the killer's identity that will be revealed at the end of the film.

The miniseries is Caine's first television role in more than 20 years, his first on American TV.

The last time he did television at all, Caine recalls, he co-starred with Christopher Plummer in a British production of "Hamlet."

"Of course, I didn't play Hamlet in that. This time I do," he says with mock smugness.

He plays the central character in the drama, Scotland Yard Inspector Frederick Abberline. The miniseries co-stars Armand Assante and Jane Seymour.

Caine said he was completely disinterested in returning to TV until the miniseries genre came along.

"Over a period of time, the miniseries had become a very valid way of filming things that wouldn't fit into an hour and 50 minutes or two hours and 10 in the movies," he said. "And so, therefore, it gained a lot of prestige as far as I was concerned, where you could do good stuff, rather than just television slop."

"I wouldn't have done it if it had been done with five TV cameras and everybody rushing around trying to change Velcro suits, because I did all that. That's what I remembered television as, because I did about a hundred shows, different plays live on television, and all I remember is a very inefficient nightmare. And if you remembered all the dialogue you were a genius, never mind if you got the performance. That didn't make any difference."

Michael Caine makes American TV debut

LONDON (AP) — Michael Caine, in period costume of long sideburns and tweed coat, settles into a Victorian chair in the quiet drawing room of the 18th-century mansion.

It's an appropriately chilly, rainy London day. But the next room is blazing bright under the quite-20th-century lights of the movie company filming CBS' "Jack the Ripper."

The two-part miniseries, airing Friday and Sunday, Oct. 21 and 23, marks the centennial of the grisly, unsolved serial killings. Writer-director David Wickes used Scotland Yard files that had been sealed for a century to develop a theory of the killer's identity that will be revealed at the end of the film.

The miniseries is Caine's first television role in more than 20 years, his first on American TV.

The last time he did television at all, Caine recalls, he co-starred with Christopher Plummer in a British production of "Hamlet."

"Of course, I didn't play Hamlet in that. This time I do," he says with mock smugness.

He plays the central character in the drama, Scotland Yard Inspector Frederick Abberline. The miniseries co-stars Armand Assante and Jane Seymour.

Caine said he was completely disinterested in returning to TV until the miniseries genre came along.

"Over a period of time, the miniseries had become a very valid way of filming things that wouldn't fit into an hour and 50 minutes or two hours and 10 in the movies," he said. "And so, therefore, it gained a lot of prestige as far as I was concerned, where you could do good stuff, rather than just television slop."

"I wouldn't have done it if it had been done with five TV cameras and everybody rushing around trying to change Velcro suits, because I did all that. That's what I remembered television as, because I did about a hundred shows, different plays live on television, and all I remember is a very inefficient nightmare. And if you remembered all the dialogue you were a genius, never mind if you got the performance. That didn't make any difference."
