Demands for better nuclear plant safety grow

WASHINGTON — Demands for improved safety procedures at U.S. nuclear weapons-making plants mounted Thursday as 31 members of the House Armed Services Committee appealed directly to President Reagan.

This crisis has not arisen suddenly but over a long period, and it stems from inadequate attention to maintenance, safety and operating conditions, the lawmakers said in a companion letter to Energy Secretary John

S. Herrington.

The letters, drafted by Rep. John Spratt, D.S.C., and signed by committee chairman Les Aspin, D-Wis., urged Reagan to appoint quickly the five-member Nuclear Facilities Safety Board, which Congress ordered created this fall to oversee the troubled weapons complex.

The lawmakers expressed particular concern over the Savannah River Plant at Aiken, S.C., where the Energy Department's last three operational weapons production reactors have been shut down for safety rea-

sons. The first will not resume producing nuclear weapons material until January, Energy Department officials have said.

"We will expect the department not to restart a reactor before assuring our committee that the applicable operating procedures assure an adequate margin of safety," they said in the letter to Herrington.

National security adviser Colin Powell, answering questions Thursday during an appearance at the National Press Club, said resolving the problems was "a top priority" in the Reagan administration. But he added

that "this is going to take more than a few slogans. ... It's going to take a lot of money."

"There are no magic-bullet solutions," he said. "These problems developed over a long period of time. We did not make the necessary investment during the '50s and '60s to upgrade these aging facilities."

Four of DOE's 17 sites have been partially or wholly shut down this year over safety concerns, prompting hearings before House and Senate panels. On Wednesday, a nationwide anti-nuclear group, Physicians for Social Responsibility, said the problems "con-

stitute a great health emergency," and urged medical studies on cancer rates among workers and neighbors of the plants.

In other developments, government documents obtained by The Associated Press show that the Energy Department gave a manager of the Savannah River Plant \$59,750 in awards for excellence despite continuing problems there.

The manager, Robert Morgan, who retired early this year, is one of many individuals

Symms slams Congress, lauds ban on waste

TWIN FALLS — The best thing the 100th Congress did was adjourn, Sen. Steve Symms said Thursday.

Stopping aid to the Nicaraguan rebels, known as Contras, however, led Symms to label the recent session the "gutless no-good 100th Congress."

The Idaho senator, in town stumping for local Republican candidates, met with local media at Republican campaign headquarters in downtown Twin Falls following a brown-bag lunch Thursday.

Symms praised Gov. Cecil Andrus' ban on waste shipments into Idaho, calling the action a "two-by-four approach" to focus national attention on nuclear waste disposal problems.

The Department of Energy is looking for a way to clean up the waste buried at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory, Symms said.

Though the Energy Department has reduced the amount it spends on cleanup in proportion to the amount spent on weapons, that will not hamper the effort to clean up the buried waste, Symms said.

"Just throwing money at it is not going to solve the problem," he said.

Though a recent poll showed Magic Valley citizens oppose the Special Isotope Separator project at INEL two to one, Symms supports the project, which would refine plutonium for nuclear weapons using laser technology.

"SIS is good for America," he said. "It is badly needed technology."

On a KLIIX radio show Thursday morning Symms said: "Technologically, what we're doing at the site, and have done, is not harmful to the environment. What we're doing now is totally safe and careful."

Symms also said he believed nothing has happened at the site since 1960 "that is of any threat to anyone."

On Jan. 5, 1963, however, one of the largest nuclear accidents in the country took the lives of three men at INEL. One of the men was reportedly impaled on a fuel rod when a reactor blew up.

Symms praised the 100th Congress for passing 13 separate appropriations bills. But said the session got off on a bad foot by wasting six months with the Iran-Contra scandal hearing.

The worst record of the Congress was in defense, he said.

The Soviet Union funneled \$350 million in aid to Nicaragua while Congress rejected further aid to the Contras, Symms said. "It now is a problem the next president will have to deal with, but it will be more difficult, he said.

Symms spoke amidst balloons and sandwiches and the applause of a small group of supporters. The bright light of the television camera and the red, white and blue plastic bunting lent an air of festivity to the nighttime activities.

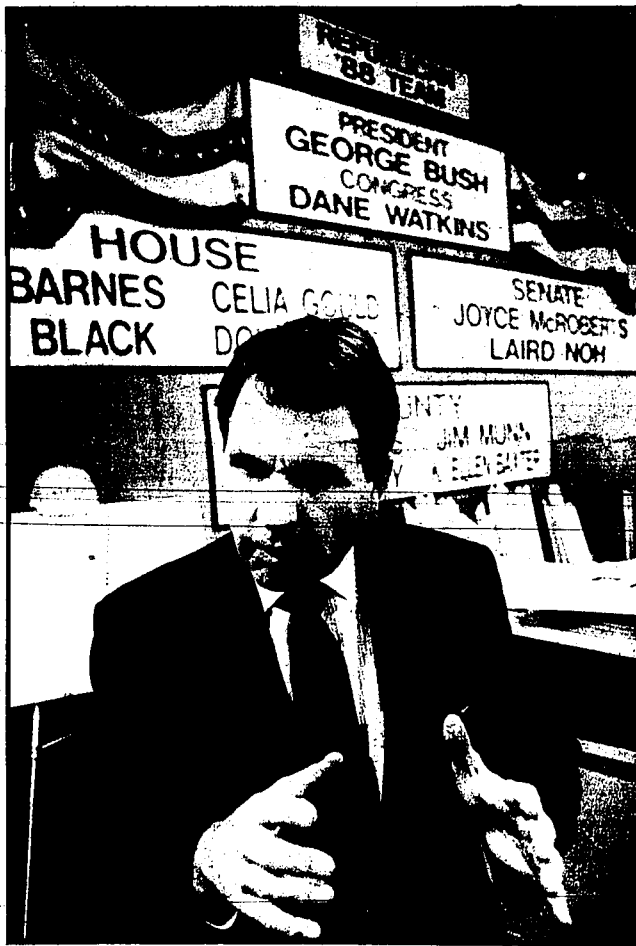
Symms introduced some of the local candidates including congressional contender Dane Watkins who is seeking to unseat Rep. Richard Stallings, D-2nd.

Watkins defended his accusations against Stallings, claiming that the Sierra Club would come to Idaho and take away people's property if Stallings were elected.

"In November we're going to decide which way we're going to go as a country," Watkins said. "It doesn't matter which way the wind is blowing. It's how we set the sail and how we set the rudder."

Watkins and Symms both spoke against Stallings' support of legisla-

Lottery foes fill coffers

BOISE — Two years ago, a proposal to have a state lottery in Idaho drew 226,000 votes, passing by 60 percent.

On the second time around, anti-lottery forces say the nearly \$500,000 they have collected will help them turn the tables in the general election.

"I just don't think they (lottery supporters) have taken us seriously, so now, they're caught short," said Randy Furniss, executive director of Consider.

The coalition of religious, temperance and other organizations disclosed Thursday it has raised \$478,256 for the effort, with more money coming in. Pro-lottery groups haven't reported yet, but are believed to have only a fraction of that amount.

"The lottery people keep talking about all the support they have. If each of the 226,000 people who voted for the lottery contributed \$2, they would match our total," Furniss said.

Consider Chairman Ken Wilde, pastor at Capital Christian Center, Boise, told a news conference on the Statehouse steps the finance report will be turned in to the secretary of state's office when it is due Tuesday. It covers contributions through Monday.

"These astounding results show solid support against the amendment," said Wilde. "The gambling proponents keep talking about all the people who want gambling. But where are they? You won't see anything even close to this in favor of HJR3 (the proposed constitutional amendment to allow a state lottery)."

Pro-lottery organizations have not disclosed their contributions yet, but spokesmen have said they have re-

Bush says he wants to create jobs; Dukakis flays diversions

George Bush pocketed a labor endorsement Thursday and said his drive for the White House was "all about creating jobs and opportunity."

Underdog Michael Dukakis accused his GOP rival of airing negative campaign commercials to "divert attention" from Reagan-Bush administration failures.

The pollsters' daily tidings were good once again for Bush, who was reported leading 51 percent to 42 percent in a nationwide survey taken for NBC and the Wall Street Journal. New polls also showed a tight race in New York, one of the country's most Democratic bastions.

Dukakis made his way toward Harry Truman's home town of Independence, Mo., likening himself to the "feisty little guy" who won the White House four decades ago in a

storied upset. "Harry Truman was a fighter and so am I," he said.

In a 14-minute live interview on the CBS "Evening News," Dukakis said again and again he wants to put the government on the "side of average Americans."

The Democrat also conceded that Bush commercials depicting him as weak on crime, defense and the environment had done him political harm. But he said they were also intended to "divert public attention from the fact that this administration has probably had more corruption and meanness than any in recent memory if not in history."

"This is not about who puts together the best commercials or best advertising," he said. "It's about which one of us, Mike Dukakis or George Bush, has the strength and the values to run this country."

Bush continued his week-long emphasis on economic issues as he

made his way down the Pacific Coast from Washington to California. Along the way he accused Dukakis of trying to "fan the flames of protectionism" in comments on trade and of "trying to scare the American people by putting Japanese flags on these American commercials of his."

Bush won the endorsement of the 50,000-member Marine Engineers Beneficial Association at a rally interrupted by protesters. Four were hustled away, including one whose nose was bloodied, and Bush pushed in his speech long enough to remind them of the high interest rates that prevailed at the end of the Carter administration.

"This election is all about creating jobs and opportunity," he said, promising to keep the economic expansion alive.

He briefly added an endorsement

Time is here to turn clocks back

Americans face that semi-annual reminder this weekend: Turn your clock back an hour. The reason is the return to standard time from daylight time.

The time change officially occurs at 2 a.m. local time in most states Sunday, moving back to 1 a.m. standard time after more than six months on daylight saving. The usual advice is to set the clock back an hour before going to bed Saturday night.

Dusk will come earlier in the evenings now, with the extra daylight shifted back to the morning.

Daylight saving time will return next April 2, shifting an hour of light back to evenings for cookeys, sports and other warm-weather activities.

New test for teachers to help weed out unfit

NEW YORK — The Educational Testing Service unveiled plans Thursday for a comprehensive new teacher licensing exam, including computer simulations of classroom situations, to help states weed out incompetents.

"There is a widespread and growing concern about the preparedness and effectiveness of beginning teachers, and we believe that breakthroughs in research and technology make possible a new kind of assessment that will provide greater assistance, fairness and accuracy," said ETS President Gregory R. Anrig.

He expressed hope that the new exam would help put to rest recurring charges by teacher unions and others that existing teacher tests don't accurately assess classroom skills and are unfair to minorities.

Jane Urdan, a spokeswoman for the American Federation of Teach-

ers, called the new test "a step in the right direction. We have said we need to test teachers differently, not only on what they know but on what they can do."

The exam is designed as a licensing tool for beginning teachers and is not intended to assess veteran teachers, Anrig stressed.

Prototypes of the exam, as yet unnamed, will be field tested in 1990, and a final version is expected to be ready in 1992, according to the Lawrenceville, N.J.-based testing service.

The test eventually is expected to replace the National Teacher Exam, a paper-and-pencil multiple choice test taken by some 200,000 teaching candidates a year and administered by ETS. That test, which costs from \$35 to \$50 depending on how many parts of it a state requires, was first offered in 1939 and is part of the teacher licensing program in 30 states.

Stallings campaign enjoys strongest financial backing in state

A mailing error has cost Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, \$1,000 in campaign contributions in his reelection race against Republican Dane Watkins.

Stallings filed his latest campaign report with the secretary of state's office in Boise on Thursday, covering the first 19 days of October. Watkins' report wasn't received as of Thursday afternoon.

It showed Stallings, running for his third term in the 2nd District, has the best-financed campaign of any

candidate this election. Stallings showed contributions of \$45,278 from Oct. 1-19, giving him a total of \$317,283 this year, plus a carryover of about \$20,000 from last year.

The other congressional incumbent, Republican Larry Craig in the 1st District, reported contributions of \$228,504 this year, with a \$48,600 carryover from last year.

Stallings reported receiving another \$3,500 from the American Trial Lawyers Association, but had to refund \$1,000 of it.

Campaign spokesman Saltee

Gasser, Pocatello, said the lawyers reached the \$5,000 limit for the general election and the last \$1,000 had to be refunded.

She said the attorney group intended to contribute \$4,000 for the primary election, but the last \$1,000 did not arrive until after the deadline and had to be counted toward the general election total.

Stallings reported receiving \$18,704 from individuals in the latest period, \$300 from political parties and \$26,250 from political action committees.

So far, he has received about

\$128,000 in individual contributions and \$172,881 from political action committees. A statement released with his latest report said he had 325 individual contributions in October, averaging \$68.

Meanwhile, in north-central Idaho, a controversy was brewing over some 15,000 Latah County GOP flyers that may violate the state's campaign disclosure law. The color brochures failed to contain the required statement of who sponsored the flyer.

Local Democratic leaders have asked the prosecutor to take action

for the violation, but County Republican Chairman Shirley Greene said it was an honest mistake with no intention of trying to fool anyone.

—To clarify the situation, the party has taken out a newspaper advertisement, explaining the central committee paid for the flyers.

County Democratic Chairman Kay Keskinen acknowledged that the issue may be a petty one, but she maintained both parties should be playing by the same rules.

At Idaho Falls, Stallings and Watkins were scheduled to make a

joint appearance Thursday night, but only area physicians and spouses were to be allowed to attend.

Diane McGee, president-elect for the Medical Society Auxiliary, said the intent was to have the candidates focus on the physicians rather than being concerned about media coverage. She said the physicians also might feel more comfortable asking questions and making comments without the media.

"We asked them (the candidates) about this some time ago and they said that was fine with them," she said.

St. Anthony could get federal prison

ST. ANTHONY (AP) — St. Anthony once again is being considered as the location for a minimum-security federal prison, said Charles Sorenson, administrative officer for the Targhee National Forest.

"We're still in the running. They are still interested," Sorenson said Thursday. "As near as we can tell, the bureau also is considering sites at Delta and Brigham City, Utah.

The Forest Service is working with the federal Bureau of Prisons to find a site near national forest lands so inmates can do public works projects while they are serving their sentences.

Three bureau officials visited St. Anthony six weeks ago to look over the community, Sorenson said. Three weeks ago, the Regional Forester's office in Ogden, Utah, asked Targhee for a report on the community and its

resources.

Targhee personnel completed that report last week, along with a video about the community. The report identifies the utility base, religious organizations, schools, parks and other resources.

Forest Service and Bureau of Prisons officials are expected to meet in November to review the potential sites, Sorenson said.

If St. Anthony is selected, it would be at least six months before the east campus of the Idaho State Youth Services Center could be renovated to house prisoners, Sorenson said.

A team from the Bureau of Prisons toured the state-owned site a year ago and looked over the Fremont General Hospital building, which is not being used. But officials later said the Idaho site was out of the question because it was too remote.

North Idaho wants NPR hearing

MOSCOW (AP) — Northern Idaho officials want a Panhandle location added to the list of public hearing sites on the proposed location of a New Production Reactor at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

INEL officials met with Moscow Chamber of Commerce and Moscow city officials Thursday to discuss the U.S. Department of Energy's plans to seek public comment on the \$3.6 billion NPR. Hearings are scheduled to begin next month in Twin Falls, Pocatello, Idaho Falls, Boise and Spokane, Wash.

The NPR would produce tritium, which is used in the production of nuclear weapons. Tritium supplies must be replenished since the radioactive gas decays after 12 years.

So far, efforts by Panhandle environmental activists to get the Energy Department to include Moscow as a hearing site have been unsuccessful.

"I think that if you would give this community the opportunity or Coeur d'Alene the opportunity, we in Idaho would be happy to host a hearing on something that is going to happen in Idaho," city supervisor Bill Smith told INEL representatives.

Teton airport plan causes debate

DRIGGS (AP) — Tradeoffs between economic development and quality of life are at the center of a debate over whether Teton Peaks Centennial Airport should be expanded to allow charter flights to bring skiers to Grand Targhee Resort.

The City-County Airport Advisory Board has proposed building an 8,500-foot runway and using the existing runway as a taxiway. More than 200 people turned out Wednesday night to discuss the \$2 million project with the Teton County Economic Development Council.

John Brewer, chairman of the Airport Advisory Board, said the expansion is planned over 10 to 20 years without spending tax money. Commercial airlines are interested in scheduling charter flights if the runway is expanded, and one airline wants to make regular charter flights this winter, he said.

But Steve Leibler, a former New

York real estate broker who has lived in the area for five years, said that would be the beginning of the end of the lifestyle so many local residents enjoy.

"We're doing OK," Leibler said. "This valley is expanding continually and gradually without an airport and maybe because we don't have an airport."

"Our merchants have the idea it's going to be Fat City ... It just doesn't work that way," he said. Outside interests will move in "and muscle out the little guys ... The local merchant hasn't got a chance."

Jobs generated by the expansion will be taken by people from outside the valley who have experience in marketing, promoting, financing and sales, he said.

"Your cost of living is going to go up as a result," Leibler said. "We're not all going to benefit, but we will all pay the price."

Airport Advisory Board member Ryan Kearney said the airport budget would be about \$80,000 a year if the city and county provide the equipment for snow removal.

"It's more than we can afford," said Burton Phillips, a candidate for Teton County commissioner.

But Morey Bergmeyer, owner of Grand Targhee, said he buys all of his supplies, food and lumber in Idaho and most of his employees live in the state. He said his taxes go to Wyoming to pay for the advertising that brings people to Teton Valley.

If 5,000 skiers fly into the valley to stay for one week at Grand Targhee, they will spend \$3.5 million "and most of that money flows directly into Idaho," Bergmeyer said.

The Economic Development Council has taken no stand on the airport expansion.

Judge enters injunction in lease case

BOISE (AP) — A Boise judge has entered a permanent injunction against a Los Angeles man accused of bilking Idaho investors out of \$150,000 over oil and natural gas leases.

The complaint was filed against Al Myers Oct. 18, more than four years after a similar action was taken against him. But Myers could not be located in 1984 and the suit against him later was dismissed.

Myers consented to Fourth District Judge Alan Schwartzman's in-

junction, but has not admitted his guilt.

He worked for Leland Capital Corp. in California from 1982 to 1984 and marketed a so-called "filing service" connected to the federal oil and gas lottery program. An injunction was successfully brought against Leland in 1984.

The lottery, run by the Bureau of Land Management, gave citizens the chance to lease federal lands for oil and gas exploration. Beside the government's \$75 entry fee, many Amer-

icans lost much more to filing services who promised to arrange a petroleum- or gas-rich lease for a steep charge.

The latest complaint by the state Finance Department charges Myers did not tell clients the leases they received were worthless pasture land. An investigation revealed as many as 50 Idahoans invested with Myers and Leland.

The injunction bars Myers from any similar activities in Idaho.

Moscow embassy to be destroyed

Too many Soviet bugs, president says

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan recommended Thursday that the new U.S. Embassy in Moscow be razed and rebuilt from the ground up because it is riddled with listening devices that cannot be removed.

Reagan told reporters the United States has "no choice" in the matter "because there's no way to rid it of the many listening devices that were built into it."

"We're going to start and have an American-built one," Reagan said of the embassy.

National security adviser Colin Powell, during an appearance at the National Press Club, said "it will be a very expensive proposition, a very, very difficult task to put up a building in Moscow."

Powell said U.S. officials would have to discuss the situation with Soviet officials and said he was hopeful something could be worked out "in light of the improving relations with the Soviet Union."

At the State Department, spokesman Charles Redman said Reagan will urge Congress to permit the virtually completed embassy to be demolished and reconstructed with American-made components to be shipped from the United States and stored in Moscow warehouses under the tightest possible security. He said the building will be assembled by U.S. workers taken to Moscow for that purpose.

The Soviets will not be permitted to move into their newly built embassy in Washington until the United States can occupy its facilities in Moscow, Redman said.

He said that tearing down the existing structure and building a new one under high security conditions

will involve "a very elaborate and costly process."

"Obviously we're talking years," Redman said.

But he said the final cost cannot now be estimated because entirely new engineering and architectural plans will have to be drawn up.

He said Reagan's proposed demolition and reconstruction plan was recommended by Secretary of State George P. Shultz following several reviews of the project by U.S. experts.

"This option offers the best overall solution to the problem," Redman said.

He said the rebuilt eight-story building will occupy the same site but will be different than the one recommended for demolition. The new structure will incorporate features "to take into account what we have learned" about Soviet eavesdropping capabilities, he said.

Every precaution will be taken to assure the security of the process," Redman said.

But he repeatedly declined to say exactly what devices the United States had discovered in the new structure or how they had been installed because "it's never in anyone's interest to let the other guy know what you know."

In Moscow, the Soviet news agency TASS said the spying allegations were "groundless, obviously far-fetched, and just as in previous cases ... the U.S. administration did not provide any material proof."

Redman said that although the cost will be high, it will be worth it to assure a secure and safe working place for U.S. diplomats in Moscow, one that will be expected to serve for at least the next half century.

CIA warned U.S. 20 years ago

WASHINGTON (AP) — More than 20 years ago, U.S. intelligence agencies warned there could be security problems if Soviet workers were allowed to help construct a new U.S. embassy in Moscow.

Those warnings aside, a 1972 agreement was reached under which the United States allowed a government-owned Soviet construction firm to build the embassy.

A Soviet engineer for five months worked with the American firm that designed the structure, and large segments were assembled off-site — out of sight of U.S. supervisors.

The arrangement led Sen. Lawton Chiles, D-Fla., to ask in 1987: "Did we put in that agreement that we believed in the tooth fairy?"

President Reagan announced Thursday that the virtually finished embassy would have to be demolished because "there's no way to rid it of the many listening devices." He said the new version would be "American-built."

In an interview Thursday, James Schlesinger, the former defense secretary and CIA chief whom Reagan commissioned to study the problem, said the president's decision to raze the structure shows "reality caught up with us."

"The United States has tended to be complacent over the years about Soviet technology," he said. "In this case, Soviet technology turned out to be immensely and impressively sophisticated."

Soviet prisoner release may only be 20

WASHINGTON (AP) — The expressed intention of the Soviet Union to release all political prisoners by the end of the year may refer only to a small group of people, perhaps as few as 20, the State Department said Thursday.

Spokesman Charles Redman said the two superpowers continue to disagree on the definition of exactly what constitutes a political prisoner.

He said Moscow insists the term fits only those actually charged with political offenses, while Washington says it also should include those jailed on "trumped-up" charges.

"We've long pressed for the release of Soviet political prisoners," Redman told reporters. "The Soviets finally accept that there are such prisoners, but we continue to disagree on a definition."

He said Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard Shevardnadze told U.S. officials during a visit to the United States last month that there were only about 40 such prisoners, all of whom had been convicted for violations of the political and religious articles of the Soviet criminal code.

But Redman said U.S. officials have raised with the Soviets the names of some 200 prisoners, including those jailed on fabricated charges.

West German Chancellor Helmut Kohl told reporters in Moscow on Wednesday that he had been assured in talks with Soviet officials that all-political prisoners would be released within 10 weeks.

However, the Foreign Ministry spokesman, Gennady L. Gerasimov, refused to confirm or deny that a release of political prisoners is imminent, saying there are only about two dozen such prisoners.

"The recent remarks made to Chancellor Kohl are an indication that all political prisoners will be released," Redman said. "But Mr. Gerasimov's statement, which followed that, leads us to believe that the Soviets may be referring only to the 40-some prisoners raised during Shevardnadze's visit in September here."

Responding to questions, Redman said he believed that about half of those 40 prisoners had been released in recent weeks leaving only about 20 or so on the Soviet list.

Reagan to veto act protecting whistleblowers

WASHINGTON (AP) — Republicans and Democrats cried foul Thursday after President Reagan, despite a written pledge of support from his budget office, said he would veto a bill that would protect federal employees who blow the whistle on government wrongdoing.

"It's outrageous conduct and has created a bipartisan explosion because it violates the basic understanding we need but now no longer have ... that an administration's word is good," said the chief Senate sponsor of the bill, Sen. Carl Levin, D-Mich.

Bipartisan critics weighed in a day after Reagan reversed the administration's position following last-minute constitutional concerns raised by Attorney General Dick Thornburgh. The president said he would "pocket veto" the bill — let it die by refusing to sign it while Congress is out of session.

U.S. encouraging liberal economics in Eastern Europe

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States is trying to encourage political liberalization in Eastern Europe by holding the prospect of eventual full integration of these countries into the Western economic system.

Deputy Secretary of State John Whitehead, who returned recently from a visit to the six Soviet allies in that region, said the United States would be prepared to "welcome these countries into the Western world," provided they continue on their reformist path.

In an interview, Whitehead outlined his impressions of his 11-day trip, which took him to Poland, Hungary, East Germany, Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria and Romania.

S. African factions all claim success in municipal balloting

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — All major factions, ranging from black activists to hard-line white segregationists, claimed success Thursday after the country's largest and most divisive municipal elections.

President P.W. Botha's National Party, although beaten by the far-right Conservative Party in dozens of white towns, triumphed in several major battlegrounds and claimed that a 33 percent turnout in contested black wards was a rebuff to activists who urged a boycott.

Anglican Archbishop Desmond Tutu, one of the leading boycott proponents, said the government's claims were "quite hilarious" and noted that only a small fraction of blacks were eligible to vote. He and other anti-apartheid leaders urged the government to ignore white extremists and negotiate to give blacks

full voting rights in national affairs. "Manipulate statistics whichever way you like," said Tutu. "The reality remains that black South Africans reject apartheid and government attempts to give it a coat of new paint."

The Conservative Party, campaigning for stricter enforcement of apartheid laws, fell short of some of its own bold predictions. It narrowly missed taking power in Pretoria, the administrative capital, where it won 19 council seats to 22 for the Nationalists, and it was beaten back in much of the Orange Free State, the most rural of the four provinces.

But the Conservatives swept to power in farming towns and small cities of Transvaal, the most populous province, winning at least 67 municipalities to 30 for the National Party.

The Nationalists for the first time

gained outright control in Johannesburg, the nation's largest city, and the Conservatives won their first seats on the council.

Both the Conservatives and the Nationalists said the overall results boded well for their prospects in a general election, expected by early 1990.

Andries Treurnicht, the Conservative leader, said his party now was in a stronger position to oppose government programs aimed at desegregating business districts and channeling more tax revenue to black areas.

Botha said it was "a vote for continued evolutionary change," and Constitutional Development Minister Chris Hennis said it would "give greater momentum" to stalled initiatives aimed at giving black moderates a limited role in central government.

Czech officials hold dissidents

PRAGUE, Czechoslovakia (AP) — Authorities detained dozens of dissidents in pre-dawn raids and tightened security in Prague Thursday at the first official communist celebration of Czechoslovakia's prewar independence.

Hundreds of policemen and members of the People's Militia, a paramilitary force, cordoned off the center of Wenceslas Square, where tens of thousands massed behind red flags and in organized groups for the official rally to mark the anniversary of independence.

Authorities banned an independent rally called for Friday by signatories of the human rights document Charter 77 and four other dissident

groups. A dissident source who asked not to be identified said about 50 activists were detained in police raids early Thursday, including dissident playwright Vaclav Havel; Roman Catholic activist Vaclav Benda; and Petr Uhl, a monitor of political harassment in Czechoslovakia.

At least 15 other activists were reported under house arrest, the source said.

In Frankfurt, West Germany, the International Society for Human Rights quoted Czechoslovak activists as saying 122 people were detained throughout Czechoslovakia. That report could not be independently confirmed in Prague.

To mark the 70th anniversary of Czechoslovakia's independence, authorities announced a limited amnesty freeing prisoners serving less than two years, or less than three years in the case of crimes committed through negligence.

The state news agency CTK did not specify whether the amnesty included the estimated 70 political prisoners in Czechoslovak jails. But a legal source suggested the measure could apply to some first-time political offenders.

The ban on the unofficial rally followed a protest march by thousands of people in August on the 20th anniversary of the Warsaw Pact invasion that crushed reforms.

Captors send photo of Anderson

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Thursday was Terry Anderson's 41st birthday, his fourth in captivity, and his captors released an old photograph of the American journalist to support a statement denying links to a woman arrested in Italy.

A statement delivered with it to a Western news agency said a photo of Anderson found in the possession of Aline Ibrahim Rizkallah, arrested in Milan last week, was a reverse print of an originally released Aug. 2, 1987.

Islamic Jihad, which means Islamic Holy War, claims responsibility for kidnapping Anderson, the chief Middle East correspondent of The Associated Press.

The Beirut staff observed the birthday in his office, which they call

"Terry's room." No changes have been made in it since his abduction in west Beirut on March 16, 1985, other than displaying the 13 photographs of him released by the kidnapers.

Staff members sang "Happy Birthday, Dear Terry" and blew out the candles on a chocolate cake.

Lebanese state television said it would show a tape later Thursday of Anderson's 3-year-old daughter, Sulaima, who was born after he was kidnapped. His other daughter, Gabrielle, was 10 at the time.

In Cadiz, Ky., Anderson's sister, Peggy Say, expressed hope for his release on or before U.S. election day Nov. 8.

He has been held longest of 14 foreigners still missing in Lebanon.

Most or all of the captives, who include nine Americans, are believed to be in the hands of radical Shiite Muslims loyal to Iran.

Italian police have said the photographs found in the woman's luggage were reproductions. They were of Anderson, American hostage Alan Sreen and a man who was not identified.

In Thursday's 22-line statement, typewritten in Arabic, Islamic Jihad said: "A negative of the picture was taken. A photograph was printed in a reverse manner."

Accompanying the statement were a copy of the Anderson photograph and a reverse reproduction of it. The reverse print appeared identical to the one found in Ms. Rizkallah's possession.

New Soviet budget aims to aid consumer

MOSCOW (AP) — The government presented its first budget designed to help the long-suffering Soviet consumer, and declared Thursday that state-run farms and companies will be shut down if they do not make profits.

Inefficient central planning also is to be curtailed, in keeping with President Mikhail S. Gorbachev's program of radical economic reform.

Officials painted a gloomy picture of Soviet life in a burst of honesty unique to the annual two-day budget sessions of the Supreme Soviet.

The national legislature's 1,500 deputies usually hear hours of dull

speeches on the success of the current Five-Year Plan, but this time they were told of cramped housing, food rotting en route to stores, jammed trains during vacation periods and new equipment unused on factory floors.

Yuri Masluykov, head of the state planning committee, promised dramatic improvements as the government shifts from its traditional emphasis on heavy industry to improving the living standard.

One cost of that departure is a deficit of \$58 billion in the 1989 budget of \$94 billion.

Finance Minister Boris Gostev blamed the deficit on past mistakes.

He described it as "a problem that has not emerged just now, but is a result of the unbalanced economy, of the policy of extensive subsidizing and huge losses, of all that was brought about by extensive methods of economic management, parasitic attitudes and a passive financial policy."

Gostev said drastic changes are necessary. Among those on his list was the possibility of bankruptcy, a device of capitalism that will be new to Soviet society.

"A number of enterprises are on the brink of being eliminated," because they are incapable of operating without massive losses, he said.

French firm may distribute pill again in future

PARIS (AP) — The French company that pulled an abortion pill off the market said Thursday it may eventually distribute the drug again.

The decision by Roussel Uclaf, manufacturer of the abortion-inducing drug RU 486, was criticized by social groups, scientists, and politicians, and hailed by anti-abortion groups, including the Roman Catholic Church.

An official at the Ministry of Health said Roussel Uclaf took the drug, also known as Mifepristone, off the market to preserve its image

abroad. Company officials said when they announced their decision Wednesday that they were reacting to an international outcry against sale of the drug.

"We could resume distribution if the atmosphere returns to normal," said Pierre Joly, vice president of

Roussel Uclaf, in an interview on French radio Thursday.

Joly denied the company acted out of fear of a threatened boycott of its products, especially in the United States.

However, he did acknowledge the furor over the drug.

cause you cannot afford the professional help your daughter needs. Contact your county or state mental health services. The United Way will make referrals for free or low-cost mental health care. There is low-cost counseling available through some local YWCAs. Treatment within your ability to pay is available. Good luck.

I am very accommodating. I've come in early and stayed late, and even come in on my day off for some clients. Some people are so inconsiderate, it's maddening. I've had women come in half an hour early while I'm eating my lunch, and they expect me to hurry up so they can get out early.

heavy in late summer just before the College of Southern Idaho's \$10 million levy election.

"I thought that would be the big push, but it wasn't," she says. She's been kept busy by new registrations the last few weeks.

In Twin Falls County for the last two weeks four or five people at a time have been registering at the courthouse steadily. Registration is

definitely up, but not unusually so for a presidential election, County Clerk Dick Pence says.

Those who have not voted in their county before, have moved within their county or changed their name since the last election need to register again. Anyone who has not voted for four years will also discover their names purged from the voter rolls.

To be eligible to vote, citizens must have lived in their county for at least 30 days and turn 18 by Nov. 8. No identification or other records are necessary to register. Residents simply sign a document swearing that they have told the truth.

The deadline for signing up with precinct registrars has already passed, so anyone wishing to register today must go to their county courthouse.

Most courthouses open for business at 8:30 a.m.

Black defends campaign fund use on skateboard ramp repair

TWIN FALLS — State Rep. Ron Black says \$400 in campaign money he used in a well-publicized skateboard ramp repair brought him more attention than advertising could have.

Although the skateboard venture was not meant as a campaign tactic, any spin-off exposure he received from it should satisfy contributors that the money was well spent, he said Thursday.

He said he received \$200 from the Idaho Education Association and \$200 from the Twin Falls Board of Realtors at the same time that he used \$400 in campaign money to put a new layer of plywood over the Frontier Field skateboard ramp in August after vandals bashed holes in it and painted obscenities on it. The ramp has since been demolished.

If contributors "to my campaign do not like the way I spent their donations then the next time they shouldn't donate to me," Black said. He also said he would return the money to dissatisfied contributors.

Black came forward with the information "to take my lumps now" in case anyone disapproved, instead of next

week, when disclosure forms are due.

Dick Kawanis, president of the Twin Falls Board of Realtors, said he would not have voted for giving the money to Black if he had known what it was going to be used for. He favors having the money returned, he said.

"We don't normally give money for skateboard (ramps). It's not what the money was meant to be used for," Kawanis said. "So of course we would be concerned."

He said he will bring the issue up at the next board meeting, and the board will decide whether to ask for the money back.

Terry Gilbert, president of the local Idaho Education Association, said it does not matter to the IEA whether Black spent the money on the "Cancer Society or the Great American Smoke-Out."

"We have contributed \$200 to his campaign based on several assumptions. One that he would incur campaign expenses—which he has—and two, that others would contribute to his campaign as well," Gilbert said.

"What Ron wishes to contribute to his church, charity or to a community organization is his private business," he said.

Gilbert said the IEA's contribution was made because

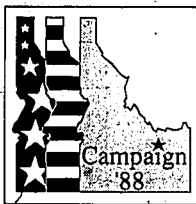
BUHL — The Legislature has too many Republicans, Alvie Johnson says.

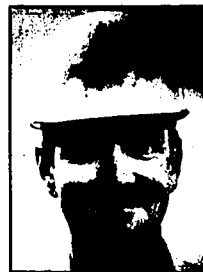

Political parties shouldn't enter county business, candidates say

TWIN FALLS — County Commission candidates partially agreed that party affiliation does not play a significant role in how the county should be run.

Incumbent Commissioner Jim Fraloy said he does not let party affiliation enter in to his decisions.

"I hope it doesn't," he said. Two Democratic candidates for County Commission, Day Eguisquiza, running against Fraloy, and Tom Lancaster, running against Republican Norma Blas, joined Fraloy in a forum Thursday night sponsored by the Saturday Press Club at the city office building. About 30 people attended.

Blas was at a week-long leadership meeting in northern Idaho and said she could not attend.

"Chicken shrimps," Lancaster said of her absence.

He said party affiliation aids politicians who want to aspire to higher office on the state and national level, but it shouldn't play a role in local politics.

"When someone comes into our office we won't inquire what office they belong to," Lancaster said.

Eguisquiza said regardless of who is in office there needs to be a good working relationship between all commissioners, but they should not try to agree on everything to the extent that innovative ideas are not presented.

She said the "group-think" pro-

cess existing at the commission, in which all three commissioners are Republican and feel they must always come to agreement on every issue, impedes discussions that can result in new ideas.

Eguisquiza said she would bring to the commission a new kind of management style in which she emphasizes listening to employees and residents, researching the situation and then getting back to the interested parties with a reply.

Any breakdown in that process would lessen the respect constituents have for commissioners. Eguisquiza, who is a reimbursement specialist at Magic Valley Regional Medical Center, said she would not let her past affiliation

Library to organize committee to decide growth for 50 years

TWIN FALLS — The Library Board of Trustees has set the criteria for organizing a committee that would decide library growth needs for the next half a century.

The committee, the Library Expansion Advisory Panel, will be comprised of 30 voting members who would make a recommendation to the library board and the City Council about what should be done, Library Director Arlan Call said.

Twenty positions will be filled within 10 days through applications from professions, service groups, the media, the business sector, library patrons and the community.

Remaining positions will be filled by members of the City Council, library board and the Foundation Board of Directors, Call said.

The first meeting will be by Nov. 15 and the group should have a recommendation by March 1, he said.

The board will identify, compare and evaluate sites for a future library by considering expanding the present site, renovating a building or constructing a new one. The board will make cost projections, prepare a priori-

ty list of proposals and recommend a financing plan.

The decision to form the panel comes after a report by Library Planning Associates Inc., which recommended in a 97-page report that the city build a new library on Falls Avenue East at Locust, with two out of four alternative sites also on Falls Avenue.

Falls Avenue and the northeast are viewed as the city's area of future growth. The library has reached a point where its facility, built in 1939 and added onto in 1973-74, is seriously limiting its options for growth. LPA states in a report that took six months to complete and cost \$5,600.

The new building would be 40,600 square feet, about twice the size of the present structure, and cost up to \$4 million.

The LPA report states that "there would be no reasonable opportunities to extend new services in the existing building without seriously compromising existing services" if the library does not expand.

It said that the staff would work under inadequate conditions that would affect morale and productivity. There would be increased costs due to the inefficiencies of the existing building, the report states.

Jerome against Preston: 'It's a tossup'

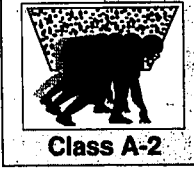





CSI director plans to change public's concept of bands

TWIN FALLS — Those who attend the College of Southern Idaho's Symphonic Band concert on Sunday will be entertained by a band that is on the move.

"I am working to elevate the band to the status of string orchestra," says Thomas Breske, a CSI music professor and symphonic band's director. "The public concept of a band is often that of a music group that plays marches at football games, but I believe a symphonic wind group

can be just as beautiful, and perhaps even more dynamic, than a string orchestra."

Breske has the credentials to back up his claim. He is a charter member of the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles and will soon begin his 25th year of teaching music at the International School of Fine Arts in Canada. For the past 17 years, Breske has been a member of the CSI faculty. He became director of the symphonic band in 1978.

Breske explains that he combines both classical and popular music into

his concerts, held once a semester. Sunday's concert, which starts at 3 p.m. in the CSI Fine Arts Auditorium, will feature the first movement of Franz Schubert's "Unfinished Symphony" along with Leroy Anderson's "Bugler's Holiday," with trumpet solos by Caroline ter Veen, Michael Lee and Tina Christensen. "Suite for Synthesizer and Band" will feature Bonnie Lamborn and Gene Conley.

Among other selections, the band will also perform the contemporary

pieces "Transformations" and "Gershwin." This segment of the program will feature melodies like "Fascinating Rhythm," "Embraceable You," "Somebody Loves Me," "Someone to Watch Over Me" and "I Got Rhythm."

Breske says he is pleased that the symphonic band concerts have become so popular with the public.

The 58-year-old native of South Dakota received his master's degree from the University of Illinois and did post-graduate work at both the University of Illinois and the Univer-

sity of Minnesota. He and his wife have three children and four grand-children. In his spare time, Breske plays sax and clarinet with the jazz group "Spectrum."

Recently, Breske began introducing the concept of computers and the synthesizer into his music theory classes. "At a recent conference, we were told that, in a year's time, the public will see a computer that has a bachelor's degree in music," he says, adding that his students are extremely enthusiastic about the new concepts.

Right now, however, Breske is spending most of his time getting ready for Sunday's big concert. "We have 70 members in the symphonic band," he says, "including students, professional people, farmers and housewives, many of whom are, or have been, members of the Magic Valley Symphony."

A \$1 donation, to be accepted at the door of Sunday's concert, will be used to fund music scholarships for college students. "The recipients of these scholarships for this semester will be introduced during the concert."

National Theatre of the Deaf presents 'King of Hearts'

HAILEY — In 1967, six people bought tickets to see the first public performance of the National Theatre of the Deaf. Twenty-one years later the company has brought audiences to their feet on six continents, bringing reviews all along the way. Now on its 42nd national tour, the

National Theatre of the Deaf will present a stage adaptation of the French film classic, "King of Hearts" Saturday at 8 p.m. at the Wood River High School Auditorium.
Sponsored by the Sun Valley Center for the Arts and Humanities, tickets are \$5 for students and senior citizens and \$10 for adults, with a \$2 discount for Center members. Front and center seats are all \$15. Tickets

may be purchased in Ketchum at the Center Gallery, Chapter One Bookstore and Magic Mountain Music, in Sun Valley at Ex Libris Bookstore and in Hailey at the Sound Socket.
You need not be deaf or hearing-impaired to enjoy this production. "King of Hearts" will be presented using a combination of sign language and the spoken word, which has been likened by critics to "sculpture in the air."

The play is set during World War I in a French town holed up by the German army. An allied soldier, drafted to locate the bombs, doesn't realize that the town's citizens — from the bishop to the madam — are really the lighthearted and lightheaded inhabitants from the local loony bin who have been left behind by the fleeing villagers.
By the time the soldier learns the truth, he's been charmed by these endearing clowns who crown him their "King of Hearts." He has found love, madness and sanity — all in one day.

The National Theatre of the Deaf is a professional ensemble of deaf and hearing actors. The company is distinguished by a unique theatrical style which combines sign language with the spoken word, enabling audiences to hear and see every word at the same time.
The visual language created by the company can be described as being to normal sign language what song is to street speech, says Laine Dyer, National Theatre of the Deaf publicity director.
"As audiences watch the language created in the air, they find a suddenly sharper, clearer understanding of the spoken word. The actor's whole body becomes a word, a thought, an emotion."

Throughout its 21-year history, the acting company has received critical acclaim for its adaptation of the classics (Chekhov, Voltaire, Homer, Moliere and Puccini) as well as for original works. The NTD has been seen on numerous television specials and regularly on the children's television program, "Sesame Street."
The NTD played a Tony Award in 1977 for Theatrical Excellence and the Connecticut Commission on the Arts Award in 1979. In 1984 the NTD performed as one of four national theater companies representing the United States at the Los Angeles Olympic Arts Festival. Two years later the company became the first professional theater from the West to tour the People's Republic of China. This past August, the NTD represented the United States at Tokyo's first International Theatre Festival.

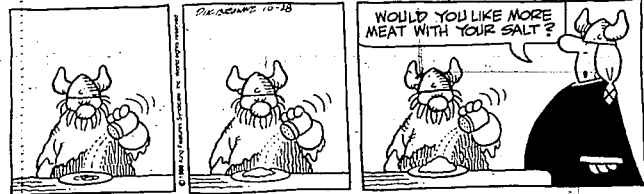

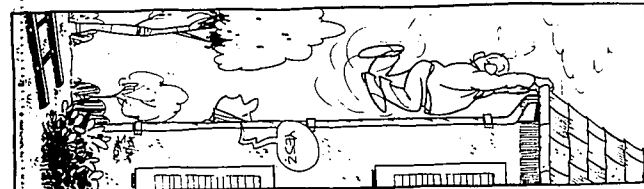

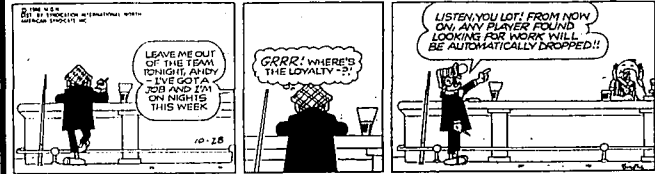

'Imagine' takes opposite view from Goldman

The following are capsule reviews of some of the films playing locally in the Magic Valley. The ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.



IMAGINE (R). At its best, it is a sensitive tribute; at its worst, it is a hero-worshipping whitewash. But there is enough footage of John Lennon from Yoko Ono's private collection in Andrew Solt and David Wolper's biography, to make up for any flaws. Anyone who lived through the period when the rebellious ex-Beatle was first a super-icon, then a smashed one, may be moved to tears. The movie is the flippside of Albert Goldman's scandal-wallowing "Lives." Someday, someone will have to guide us into the reality between.

ALIEN NATION (R). An attempt to freshen up the formula cop-buddy picture with a futuristic allegory about the evils of discrimination is

too thin to be effective. James Caan stars as a repressed cop with some Archie Bunker attitudes directed inward by humans from another planet who serve as symbols of any of the racial or ethnic minorities. Mandy Patinkin plays the first "Newcomer"—i.e., humanoid—to make detective and winds up as Caan's partner. Standard fare despite gimmicky. With Terence Stamp.

GORILLAS IN THE MIST (PG-13). With a sense of beauty and wonderment, this most unusual and challenging of African adventure films illuminates an extraordinary and unprecedented communication between a human being and the world's

largest primates, the endangered mountain gorillas of East Africa. Under Michael Apted's caring and judicious direction Sigourney Weaver is absolutely stunning as the heroic and controversial primatologist; Dian Fossey. With Bryan Brown, Julie Harris.

MEMORIES OF ME (PG-13). A seriously unloved comedy by people with unwavering faith in clichés. Because Henry Winkler directed and Billy Crystal co-wrote, co-produced and co-stars in this weakly dreadful one, and they of all people must know better, this seems disingenuous. It is too bad, because Crystal is good at his character's wary self-protectiveness and Alan King, who carefully directed, can be a shrewd and juicy.

PUNCHLINE (R). Bold, sneaky and brilliant, "Punchline" works its change-ups unmercifully. The cheesy arena that writer-director

David Seltzer has picked is the acrid, hostile world of stand-up comedy. Tom Hanks' range is enough to surprise even lovers of "Big." What might be overshadowed by the lights and darks of Hanks' character is the strength of Sally Field's performance, although her physical comedy is worthy of Lucille Ball.

SWEET HEART'S DANCE (R). Writer Ernest Thompson ("On Golden Pond") looks at male bonding in a small Vermont town: Two lifelong buddies (Don Johnson, Jeff Daniels) and the women (Susan Sarandon, Elizabeth Perkins) whom they persecute or love. Some very nice observations of small-town life are buried under fishy marital counseling and an avalanche of cute cracks. The characters spend so much time trying to one-up and upstage, you can practically see them elbowing each other to the wings. Yet, given the circumstances, the four leads win some of your heart back anyway.

Halloween IV proves tiresome

HOLLYWOOD—Remember the good old days when Halloween meant trick-or-treat, bobbing for apples and bags full of candy bars? When the holiday's main movie image was wide-eyed little Margaret O'Brien, as Tootie in "Meet Me in St. Louis"?

How times change. Nowadays, mention of "Halloween"—and the ridiculously inevitable new horror sequel, "Halloween 4"—suggests frantically groping small-town teenagers, interrupted in their promiscuous love-play to be hideously slaughtered by a white-masked, blood-thirsty fiend.

Gore. Skewerings. Carnage. Little girls running around in clown suits pursued by maniacs. Eviscerated corpses. Charred corpses. Howling

lynch mobs. Once again, Haddonfield, Ill., that hunk of complacent suburbia where unkillable psychotic Michael Myers wreaked his bloody will 10 years ago, is subject to the peregrinations of this taciturn slash-or-come-home. Now, he is stalking his little niece, Jamie (Danielle Harris). And her doggie. And her mama. And everybody else.

Once again, thoughtless, lustful teen-agers paw one another, while the smiler with a knife—and an ax and a truck—waits to pounce. Once again, Donald Pleasence, as psychiatrist Loomis, runs around pleading with everyone to realize that Michael is evil incarnate, conquerable only by several police forces, the National Guard and perhaps a small ther-

monuclear device. Myers is not just a man, not just a monster. He is something far more loathsome and destructive: a high concept from hell.

Anyone who goes to "Halloween 4" deserves what they get: stale, sordid tricks and no treats. Original writer-director John Carpenter has long since bailed out, survived only by a snatch of music and a pastiche of his patented subjective tracking shots. Jamie Lee Curtis is present only in a snapshot (And at that, she gives one of the film's more animated performances). Donald Pleasence is still there, sadly enough, wandering around in a mass of scar tissue, giving this hopeless trash a patina of class. But he looks weary unto death, as if the prospect of being disemboweled by a maniac bodied sweet, merciful release. What is more remorseless and cruel than an endlessly rampaging sequel?

Don Johnson picks sensitive role

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif.—"Miami Vice" star Don Johnson has kept the photographer waiting long enough. He finally descends from the top floor of his Beverly Hills hotel bungalow and slips into a broadened armchair, his shirt open to the waist.

He has a few ideas of his own about how the photo session should proceed. "What lens are you using?" he demands. Then, a bit later, refusing a pose: "This is not a flattering angle. I've been in this business a long time, and I can usually tell what looks good."

Minutes into the session, Johnson declares that he has had enough and walks out. Just like that, the session is over. "These pictures always look lousy in the newspaper anyways," he calls over his shoulder as he moves back up the steps.

Welcome to the tempestuous world of Don Johnson, where cool telegenic charm can disappear into a black hole of celebrity behavior faster than a speedboat in the Miami night. Johnson's temper is already legendary in the Florida city that loaned its name to his stylish cop series. He stormed out of Miami last year after publicly blasting its press and city leaders. Both, he told USA Today last year, were guilty of "maligning" and "missing" "Miami Vice" and its stars—even though, he added, the show had boosted tourism to Miami by 12 to 15 per-

cent.

There is not a lot of love lost between Miami and Don Johnson, but then maybe it does not matter much anymore. Johnson has confided to associates that he would not be heartbroken if this was the last season for "Miami Vice," which has dropped from the ninth most popular show during its second season to No. 45 last season. As the series begins its fifth season, which debuts Nov. 4, Miami may not have Don Johnson to kick around any more.

Johnson is already turning some of his attention to feature films. Friday, theater audiences will be treat-

ed to the first movie he has made since "Miami Vice" rocketed this son of a Kansas farmer and his beautiful wife to fame after a decade-long struggle up the show-business ladder.

In "Sweet Hearts Dance," released by Tri-Star, Johnson stars alongside two Hollywood veterans—Susan Sarandon and Jeff Daniels—and the rising young star Elizabeth Perkins. He plays Wiley Boon, a carpenter in a small New England town who gets more fulfillment out of climbing gymnasium ropes with his high school buddy (Daniels) than going home to his longtime wife and high school sweetheart (Sarandon). It is an examination of the Peter Pan principle that allegedly afflicts so many thirtysomething men.

Johnson's reputation for sometimes being difficult and demanding on the set did not stop director Robert Greenwald from hiring the TV actor for "Sweet Hearts Dance." In fact, Greenwald says that he liked the edge that Johnson's personality could bring to his character.

"He is as emotional and moody and funny and smart as Wiley Boon is," Greenwald says of Johnson. "I will never, as long as I live, say that he's easy. But he is good."

In the kitchen she saw a black pot. It stuck to the floor. There were empty bottles on the counter. On the living room couch Sam lay asleep. Everything was a mess.

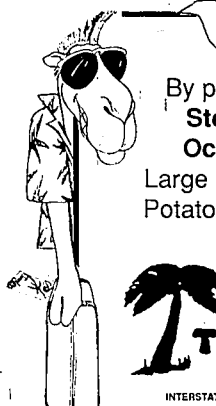

Robert Loggia portrays FBI agent in NBC's miniseries 'Favorite Son'

"Don't tell him we said so, but Norman Mailer is wrong. Tough guys do dance."

Just ask Robert Loggia, who continues a 30-year career playing rough-hewn caballeros in the three-part miniseries "Favorite Son," airing Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, Oct. 30 to Nov. 1 on NBC.

Loggia portrays jaded-but-honest FBI agent Nick Mancuso in this tale of ambition, murder, and intrigue in the inner, most corridors of Washington. "Favorite Son" is based on the Steve Sohmer novel in which a popular Texas senator survives an apparent assassination attempt to become a leading candidate for the vice presidency. Mancuso, assigned to investigate the assassination, is determined to get to the bottom of it — despite some very formidable opposition. "It's sort of tailor-made for me," Loggia says. "The description of Nick Mancuso's background is not unlike mine. My parents were born in Sicily. I had a traditional Italian family, six sisters and a lot of cousins."

When Loggia told his family he wanted to be an actor, "My father was somewhat aghast. I graduated in journalism from the University of Missouri, and he very much wanted me to be what he called 'a professional man.' And I guess being an actor didn't seem too professional."

"When I got out of the Army in '53, I was faced with the choice of getting a job on a paper or trying to be an

actor. As I was pounding the pavement looking for a news job, I ran into a college buddy who'd become an agent. So he sent me up to an audition, two weeks out of the Army, and I got a part on a television show that Hume Cronyn was starring in."

Loggia began appearing on TV regularly during television's "Golden Age." "We would rehearse a 'Studio One' or a 'Playhouse 90' for maybe three weeks, then do it live. Everything had to work perfectly — and often didn't."

Loggia starred in two series, "The Nine Lives of Elfege Baca" and "T.H.E. Cat." He also turned down the title role in "Ben Casey." "I read the script and didn't like it. I thought none of it played well: a doctor fighting off juvenile delinquents while performing a miracle operation. It was only one of the great hit shows of all time."

Loggia endured a period in which he felt trapped into playing heavies. Now he would prefer playing more positive characters. "I think Nick Mancuso in 'Favorite Son' is a very positive character: the individual-can-make-a-difference kind of roughness that really covers up a softie."

Viewers of last summer's smash

movie "Big" will no doubt recall Loggia's scene with Tom Hanks, in which the two danced atop a giant keyboard to play "Heart and Soul." "That was a miracle that it came off the way it did," says Loggia of the scene. "They had some standby dancers there, but it came off so well that they sent the dancers home. Everybody was amazed." This from the man who won an Academy Award nomination as a foul-mouthed gumshoe in "Jagged Edge"? The drug dealer in "Scarface"? The godfather's son in "Prizzi's Honor"? And now he wants to play a softie?

But then you remember this is also the man who said, "Film crews, including the actors, are sort of like a combat troop."

Sure, tough guys dance. They're just particular about who calls the tune.

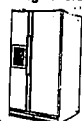

Q: We're big fans of River Phoenix, the teen-age actor who co-stars in the new movie, "Running on Empty." How did he get such a weird first name? — B.S.

A: Phoenix is a true child of the '60s, even though he was born in 1970. His parents named him for the "river of life" in a novel by Hermann Hesse, a popular writer among some students and intellectuals of the '60s. The actor's last name recalls the mythical bird of great beauty that burned itself to death only to rise in youthful vigor from the ashes. Phoenix, the actor, likes music and keeping up with his nomadic family, which has lived in some 40 different locations in the 18 years since River entered the scene.

Q: What about those rumors that Ted Kennedy is getting back together with his ex-wife, Joan? — V.L.

A: That's the rumor making the rounds in Palm Beach, Fla., where Rose Kennedy, the family matriarch, still maintains a home. Joan has had more than a few problems since her marriage to Kennedy broke up, mostly with alcohol. Ted Kennedy's life hasn't exactly been a bed of roses, either, as his presidential ambitions have receded farther and farther over the horizon. The word is that they both have been considering remarriage each other.

Q: Now that he's approaching middle age, isn't it true that Richard Gere is getting weirder and more idiosyncratic? — M.S.

A: Gere, who's only 39, has never been a model of conventionality. But he isn't getting dotty with age. A former philosophy major at the University of Massachusetts, Gere is a student of Eastern religions. He's even met the Dalai Lama, Tibet's premier religious figure. Despite the headlines linking him with Priscilla Presley — which Gere laughingly dismisses — he's a serious, philosophical man who appears to improve with age.

Q: I've been reading conflicting reports about Muhammad Ali's general health problems. What's this macho boxing great's condition these days? — M.M.

A: Surprisingly good. At a recent

press conference announcing "The Muhammad Ali Story," a 6-hour, \$7-million documentary based on his life (it's expected to be aired in 1990), he looked well and fielded questions adroitly. When a reporter asked him his opinion of Mike Tyson's marital mess, Ali smilingly responded, "I really don't think that's any of my business." His speech was whispery and measured, but not slurred, as has been reported, and he walked rather carefully.

Q: You mentioned in a recent column that some friends of Ronald and Nancy Reagan were arranging the purchase of a home in Bel Air, Calif., for them to live in when they leave the White House. Who organized this and how much was the house? — G.T.

A: Eighteen West Coast friends, headed by multimillionaires Holmes Tuttle and Earle Jorgensen, got together for the deal. The house cost \$2.5 million. One rumored sidelight is that the mansion's street address was quietly changed from 666 to 668. The number 666 has been associated throughout history with black magic and the occult, and was thought to be inappropriate for the Reagans.

Q: We hear that "Dynasty's" Linda Evans is really pining for an old boyfriend she dumped. What's it all about? — A.R.

A: Sometime last year, Linda moved in with her longtime flame, Richard Cohen. He lives in a posh section of Los Angeles, and is described — by someone other than Linda — as

Soap opera actress Brock writes play considered for off-Broadway

Beautiful, blonde, green-eyed actresses on soaps are not rare. But how about a beautiful, blonde, green-eyed soap actress who also happens to have written a play that was given a showcase production and is currently being considered for off-Broadway?

Brenda Brock, who is seen as Brenda McGillis in "One Life to Live," is that lovely young actress-playwright. Brenda hails from Texas. Although she has been involved with performing most of her life, she set out to become a nurse (a little bit of irony, since her character on the soap is a nurse) and majored in nursing at the University of Texas at Austin until her final semester. At that time, a group of her geology student-friends were going on a dig near the Texas-Mexican border and asked her if she wanted to take a sabbatical and come along as their cook. Impulsively, Brenda said yes.

For the next two years, she played a variety of roles while learning her craft as an actress. Her parents were a bit troubled by Brenda's decision to become an actress, but her dad also told her that she shouldn't pile up regrets about not having tried something in her life.

Then came New York and the search for acting roles. It was during this period that the playwright in Brenda emerged.

"I was a bit lonesome and I was

working odd jobs just to pay my bills while I was studying and looking for acting jobs. I sat down and started to write just one scene which I was going to use in an acting class. The one scene became two and three and before I knew it, I was writing a play."

Brenda has had her work produced at a professional theater unit in New York and there is definite interest in developing the work for a full-scale production. She is also at work on a second play in conjunction with the famed Actors Studio playwright and directing unit.

Of course, most of her energy these days is devoted to playing Brenda McGillis in "One Life to Live," and she's enjoying every minute of it. So is her mother, who has become a sort of celebrity in the local beauty salon where she goes to have her hair done each week. Brenda's dad is also puffed up with pride about Brenda's career — and he finally got to see his daugh-

ter in those nurses' whites. Even her brother, who is a businessman with his own oil company, has become a faithful viewer of "One Life to Live."

Brenda does have one regret. She wishes that her grandmother had lived just a little longer, long enough to have seen Brenda on the soap. Grandma was an avid fan of "One Life to Live" — just think what a thrill it would have been to see Brenda rubbing shoulders with Viki/Niki and Clint.

Dan Lauria plays police sergeant in 'Cop Killer,' a series remake

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Dan Lauria believes that one reason he works so much as an actor is that few people in the film business look at old movies.

He plays the overworked father on ABC's "The Wonder Years" and has had recurring roles on two other series. He was in the movie "Stakeout" and played Bernadette Peters' boyfriend in the TV movie "David." This Saturday, he plays the veteran police sergeant in "Cop Killer," the first installment of the remake of the anthology series "Police Story" on ABC.

"People don't watch the old movies," said Lauria. "Nobody knows Richard Conte. I go in for a part and do my Richard Conte or Van Heflin. Nobody knows I'm stealing. I steal from the best and I don't feel bad about it."

Lauria appears with Ken Olin and Patricia Wettig, the husband-and-wife stars of ABC's "thirtysomething," in the premiere episode of "Police Story."

ABC revived "Police Story" last summer during the writers' strike when it appeared the networks would not have new shows ready for the fall season. The series, created by author Joseph Wambaugh, ran on NBC from 1973-77. Lauria's role was originally played by Cameron Mitchell.

"I'm the veteran police sergeant," said Lauria. "Kenny Olin is the young stud cop. Olin's partner is taken hostage during a traffic stop. They're bank robbers and it turns into a fire-fight. His partner is killed and Kenny kills a bank robber and gets a medal. Even though he did everything by the book, Kenny goes through a psychological change."

"I loved working with Kenny. He didn't walk through it. We talked over the characters, which is rare for television. This is more of a drama about what happens to this man than an action picture."

Lauria grew up watching old movies, and still watches them regularly from his large collection of tapes. His ambition is to work with James Stewart.

"I grew up in Lindenhurst, N.Y., and my aunt lived with us when I was young," he said. "I was a big jock in school. When I got home from practice I'd eat dinner and my aunt would send me straight to bed. Then, she'd wake me in the middle of the night. She'd say, 'James Cagney.' Or 'James Stewart,' or 'Tyrone Power.' I'd get up and watch the most wonderful movies."

"When the networks decided to revive some old shows during the writers' strike I don't know why they went back to the 1970s. They should have gone back to the 1950s and redone those great live dramas. I can think of a lot of shows that stand up pretty well today."

Lauria began acting at Southern Connecticut University, which he attended on a football scholarship. As a captain in the Marine Corps, he served briefly in Vietnam and at Quantico, Va., where he shared an office with Oliver North. He also re-

ceived a master's degree from Yale and a degree in playwriting from the University of Connecticut.

"I'm the adviser on 'The Wonder Years' since it takes place in 1968," he said. "The producers, Neal Marlens and Carol Black, were only 12 at the time. So, if a question comes up, they look at me like the old guard. The real stars of this show are the scripts. They are so wonderful."

"I didn't want to do the part at first. They offered me more money. I said it wasn't the money. Then Carol cried. I said, 'Wait, a producer who cries?' The reason I said no was that I figured it would last for eight years. I didn't want to be locked up that long."

Lauria has a recurring role on ABC's "Hooperman" as Barbara Bosson's husband. Until its cancellation, he played a detective on CBS' "Cagney & Lacey." He worked in the precinct where Mary Beth Lacey lived, and was the one who arrested her when she joined a protest march.

Final World Series game tops weekly ratings for Nielsen

NEW YORK (AP) — The conclusion of the World Series topped the Nielsen ratings and gave NBC another victory in the Niensens last week, but everybody got a share of the top 10, with ABC adding the new "Roseanne" and CBS scoring with the finale of "Jack the Ripper."

The final game of the five-game series between the Los Angeles Dodgers and Oakland was the highest-rated program of the week with a 26.3 rating and 43 share.

A rating point equals 904,000 homes with televisions. The share is a percentage of sets in use.

The average for NBC's five-game coverage was a 23.7 and 39, one rating point higher than the first five games of last year's series between Minnesota and St. Louis.

NBC won the week ending Oct. 23

with an average prime-time rating of 18.8. ABC was second with a 13.9, and CBS third with 12.7.

The top-rated shows of the week were: "World Series — Game 5," "The Cosby Show," "World Series — Game 3" and "World Series — Game 4," all on NBC; "Roseanne" and "Who's the Boss?" ABC; "NBC Monday Night Movie — Double Standard," "60 Minutes," "CBS Sunday Movie — Jack the Ripper, Part Two" and "Murder, She Wrote," CBS.

ABC's "World News Tonight" and the "CBS Evening News" tied for first place in the news ratings with an average 10.2 and 20 share. "NBC Nightly News" was third with an 8.9 and 18, but its rating was lowered by pre-emptions for baseball.

For the first time in a long time, most of the programs on the prime-time schedule were not reruns.

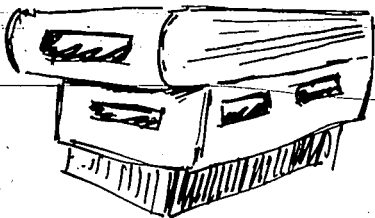

A: Hunter died in 1969 at the age of 43 following brain surgery after an accidental fall. 'Head of the Class' students take field trip to Moscow

"Head of the Class" returned a couple of weeks ago for its third season on ABC, and already the "students" are out of the classroom and off on a field trip — this time to Moscow.

In a one-hour special Wednesday night, teacher Charlie Moore's intellectually gifted teen-agers debate Soviet students on Russian turf, a follow-up to an episode last season in which some young Soviet scholars visited Fillmore High School.

Thanks to glasnost, the "Class" cast became the first Americans to film inside the Kremlin, according to Dan Schneider, 22, who plays Dennis in the series. They also filmed in Gorky Park and the Moscow Metro.

Their co-stars were Soviet actors, some of whom learned their English lines phonetically and "didn't understand what they were saying."

Dennis and his pal Arvid (Dan Frischman) "think we're being chased by the KGB," Schneider explained. "We get lost, and we're late for the competition. Of course, wackiness ensues."

For Schneider, the 12-day trip to the Soviet Union provided "the most

memorable experience — and the most indelible — for a long time to come. I wouldn't want to make a semi-yearly trip to Russia. But it was pretty startling. You wonder if all the things you've heard are true.

"We stayed in a huge hotel, 1,000 rooms, and in the main lobby there was one old man with a dial phone for all of them. My room was a quarter-mile from the elevator. They have these large, cylindrical shaped women every hundred yards or so in the halls who check your identification.

Folks in Moscow, he found, "don't really want to have anything to do with you. They wave and look in the other direction. Young people were a little friendlier. They didn't know who we were. They didn't even know Mike Tyson (estranged husband of co-star Robin Givens). I had lunch with Tyson one day, and the waiter said, 'Cassius Clay?'"

The cast, working in cold, rainy Moscow and staying in an unheated hotel, came down with colds, he said. "But it was a valuable experience. I'm not a real political person, but it really sort of confirms that our system is pretty darn good."
