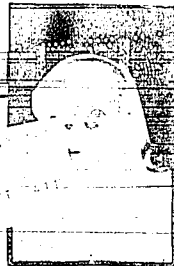

Terrorists may have downed Flight 103

LOCKERBIE, Scotland — Britain's top anti-terrorism official joined the investigation Thursday into the crash of a Pan Am jumbo jet, and the airline and U.S. government disclosed they were warned two weeks ago that terrorists would attack a U.S. jetliner.

In London, an unidentified caller claimed an Islamic group blew up the Boeing 747, killing all 258 people aboard and 22 on the ground, to avenge the U.S. downing of an Iranian civilian airliner in July. Pan Am lowered the figure of those aboard the plane

when it discovered that a flight attendant traveling as a passenger was counted twice. Authorities said Pan Am Flight 103 likely exploded in the air Wednesday evening before it plunged into Lockerbie, a village in southwest Scotland. The blazing debris gutted dozens of homes and cars. Witnesses said the plane appeared to be on fire before it crashed.

The State Department said it had warned its embassies about a bomb threat against a

Pan Am jet on Dec. 7, two days after a threat was made, but the general public was not informed. The White House acknowledged that travelers should be made aware of such threats in the future.

The flight originated in Frankfurt, West Germany, changed planes in London and was in the air 54 minutes when it vanished from radar screens at 7:19 p.m. (12:19 p.m. MST) on Wednesday. Authorities said the plane was on course and weather conditions would not have contributed to the crash.

Transport Secretary Paul Channon said the plane's flight data and cockpit voice recorders had been found.

The dead included 38 Syracuse University students who had been studying abroad and were returning home for the holidays; at least six U.S. servicemen; Berni Carlsson of Sweden, the U.N. commissioner for Namibia; and John Mulroy, director of international communications for The Associated Press.

The jet, which destroyed 40 houses, killed 22 people on the ground, most of them occupants of cars pounded by wreckage, said Desmond Park, a local official.

The area police chief, John Boyd, said 13 adults and four children who had been in Lockerbie when the plane crashed were un-

accounted for. Others were feared killed in five cars that were gutted by wreckage.

People living up to 20 miles away reported finding clothing and Christmas cards hurled from the jet. Britain's worst-ever air crash sent a wave of grief across the country. Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher sent President Reagan her condolences and toured the devastated village of 2,500.

Women prepared tea and cakes at the Roman Catholic church anticipating the arrival of relatives of the dead.

Police Superintendent Angus Kennedy told

Head man says safety DOE's job

WASHINGTON — Energy Secretary John Herrington said Thursday the Energy Department must accept responsibility for the problems now plaguing the country's aging nuclear defense production facilities.

"Regrettably, the environmental, health and safety practices at our facilities do not measure up to 1988 standards," Herrington said in a speech at the National Press Club.

New production facilities, such as the reactor scheduled for future construction at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory, are the ultimate solution to production and safety needs, Herrington said.

"A healthy, viable nuclear weapons complex is not an option for this country — it is a necessity, just as it has been for more than 40 years," said the departing Energy chief, who noted that he has been a staunch supporter of the Reagan administration's military buildup.

Although the nuclear waste storage problems now affecting storage facilities at Rocky Flats and INEL were not addressed, Herrington stressed that environmental and safety standards must not be sacrificed in order to maintain a strong national nuclear deterrent.

Dan Reicher, a spokesman for the Natural Resources Defense Council who attended Thursday's speech, said that despite those assurances, DOE is failing to meet fundamental safety standards.

"The unfortunate dynamic at the department is that production still takes precedence over safety and the environment," Reicher said.

"I think we've only seen the tip of the iceberg as far as environmental contamination goes at INEL," Reicher said.

More than \$1.4 billion is now being spent annually on environment and safety improvements, Herrington said. The Energy Department will seek additional cleanup funds in for the 1990 budget, Herrington said, although he would not specify an amount.

Other corrective measures include a comprehensive survey environmental problems at defense production

Travel warnings come with storm

TWIN FALLS — State weather and highway officials are warning the hundreds of local holiday travelers this weekend to be careful out there.

Thursday afternoon the first of several Pacific storm systems rolled into the Magic Valley, leaving most areas white with snow. Two to four inches were predicted.

Idaho State Police Dispatcher Lisa Evans said roads late Thursday were slick and snow-covered from Twin Falls to Boise. Poor road conditions were expected to continue today.

Area residents can expect more snow from this storm than the one earlier this week, because it will pass directly over the Magic Valley. Bill Galkin of the National Weather Service in Kimberly said. The storm was already causing problems in Boise Thursday before moving south.

The Ada County Highway District said its 21 sanding trucks couldn't keep up with the demand, despite starting at 4 a.m.

In the three-hour period ending at 2 p.m., Boise accumulated 1 1/2 inches of new snow. Gusty winds up to 33 mph were reported in the Mountain Home area with gusts to 26 mph at Twin Falls.

This storm and a series of storms following it through the Christmas weekend may make traveling unpleasant, Galkin said. He predicted that winds will continue in the 10-to 20-mph range, causing drifting on north-south roads.

"Travelers are going to have a slow time of it," he said.

The state Highway Department is advising people to stay home if possible, but to use common sense if they decide to travel.

Make sure the gas tank is full — few gas stations will be open Christmas Eve and Christmas Day — and that windshield wipers are in good condition. Carry tire chains, warm blankets and, for heaven's sake, fasten your seatbelt, said state Maintenance Engineer Clayton Sullivan.

And before you start out, check the road reports. A recording despite starting at 4 a.m.

Ocean temperature, drought may be tied

WASHINGTON — Some of this year's drought in the Midwest may have been caused by ocean temperature abnormalities near the equator in the Pacific Ocean, according to a new computer study reported Thursday.

Such droughts could be anticipated if the temperature abnormalities turn out to be predictable, one of the authors said in the report appearing in today's issue of Science magazine.

The authors are Kevin E. Trenberth and Grant W. Branstator of the National Center for Atmospheric Research in Boulder, Colo., and Phillip A. Arkin of the Climate Analysis Center of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration in Camp Springs, Md.

They noted that when asked what caused the drought that hit

much of North America in 1988, meteorologists often cite only a change in the jet stream.

Their proposed answer focuses on the development in April, May and June of drought in the Midwest, while there were alternating high and low pressure centers across much of the northern half of the Western Hemisphere.

In this period, Pacific Ocean temperatures ranged up to 5.4 degrees Fahrenheit below normal in a narrow band extending about 4,000 miles along the equator westward from the coast of South America.

At the same time, a bit to the north, surface temperatures ranged up to 0.9 degrees above normal.

When this temperature pattern was fed into the computer, the pattern of stationary alternating high and low pressure systems was reproduced.

Bush chooses Lujan for Interior post, Reilly as EPA director

WASHINGTON — President-elect Bush turned to a retired New Mexico congressman and a consensus-building Washington conservationist to head the nation's top environmental posts Thursday.

He nominated Rep. Manuel Lujan Jr. as Interior Secretary and William K. Reilly as head of the Environmental Protection Agency.

"Not only does Manuel Lujan know the issues, he also shares my commitment to finding a careful balance between the need to protect our environment and the desire to

proceed with the sound development of this nation's many valuable resources," Bush said.

While Lujan's nomination drew praise from lawmakers, environmental groups called it "an unfortunate choice."

Bush also named Dr. Louis Sullivan as secretary of Health and Human Services; former Illinois Rep. Edward Derwinski to head the new Department of Veterans Affairs; and Samuel Skinner, Chicago mass transit official, to be secretary of transporta-

tion.

Bush was under pressure to appoint a Western Republican and selected Lujan from a field of former lawmakers and moderate environmentalists. Lujan stepped down this year after 20 years in the House, where he was the second ranking Republican on the House Interior and Insular Affairs Committee.

Environmentalists said Lujan has had little sympathy for conservationist causes nationwide but has been willing to compromise when it came to issues affecting his home state.

For his home state, Lujan successfully sponsored legislation that set aside more

than 600,000 acres of New Mexico land as wilderness areas. However, in 1987, he voted against a measure that would have protected endangered sea turtles from shrimp harvesters.

"He has not had a record of a strong environmental supporter," said Bruce Hamilton, director of conservation field services for the Sierra Club. He is generally not someone who has led environmental causes, but occasionally votes for them."

In contrast to the Lujan nomination, Reilly was heartily applauded by ecologists, who commended Bush for being the first president to appoint the head of a nationwide conservation group high-level government post.

The president of the Conservation Foundation and the World Wildlife Fund, Reilly is regarded as an outsider among environmentalist groups and prefers to negotiate with government and industry officials rather than filing suit or taking sides on legislation.

"He understands not only the overwhelming domestic imperative to take steps to protect our environment, but the need for international cooperation," Bush said.

Hamilton, who commended Reilly's selection, said Lujan is a compromise candidate between the Western conservatives and moderate Republicans, who favored retired Sen. Dan Evans, R-Wash., and former Tennessee

Judiciary looks for better ways of resolving custody disputes

BOISE (AP) — Idaho's judiciary system is starting a statewide effort to find a better way to resolve child custody disputes.

The Idaho Supreme Court, which administers the state court system, said Thursday it has appointed a committee of judges and lawyers to develop plans to help divorcing couples resolve disputes over children without going through court battles.

The committee will work up a plan for court-sponsored mediation services. That will include standards for mediators and educating bench and bar about alternatives to formal litigation.

The committee emphasizes lawyer participation, and includes two former presidents of the Idaho State Bar, Marcus Nye of Pocatello and Gerald Weston, now a 3rd District

judge.

State courts already are experimenting with court-sponsored mediation. A pilot program in Ada County, launched by Magistrate Patricia Young, has been followed by similar programs in Valley and Bonner counties.

In those programs, divorcing families are encouraged to view a court-produced videotape which discusses the needs of children during divorce and encourages parties to seek mediated settlement in the best interests of the children.

Mediators drawn from the community then help divorcing couples agree how to handle custody and visiting arrangements.

Weston, who will serve as chairman, said 36 states have some sort of mediation programs but only eight

have statewide programs.

"Formal litigation can polarize people and can add an emotional element to disputes which is out of place when the needs of children are involved," he said.

He listed the Idaho State Bar's sponsorship of "Settlement Week" programs as evidence that lawyers support efforts to resolve disputes without going to court.

Carl Bianchi, administrative director for the courts, said the judicial system will try to evaluate results of mediation programs, to ensure that people who choose to try it are treated fairly.

He said the major factor behind the program is to achieve "a better quality decision — one which has better results for the children of families in transition."

Officials want additional time for farmers to answer FmHA

BOISE (AP) — Idaho's agriculture director and other industry officials say the Farmers Home Administration should give farmers more time to restructure delinquent loans.

Director Dick Rush joined his counterparts from six other states Wednesday in urging FmHA to extend recently announced deadlines.

"Few farm borrowers have had time to adequately read the two-pound packet of information FmHA has mailed to these producers, much less gather the necessary financial information," Rush said, "and only a handful of farmers have had time to seek financial counseling."

Joining Rush in making the request to FmHA acting administrator

LaVerne Ausman were state agricultural officials from Texas, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Ohio, Oklahoma and Vermont.

Rush said he feels the timing of the process has been particularly troublesome for many producers. "It has come right in the middle of the holidays and the harvest season when farmers are too busy to respond adequately to the government forms," he said.

Rep. Larry Craig, R-Idaho, also issued a statement urging federal officials to give more consideration to farmers hard-pressed to meet deadlines to file the financial information.

"It would be in everyone's best interest to take a breather during the

holidays and then start this program off on the right foot early in 1989," he said.

FmHA's debt restructuring program is required by the Agricultural Credit Act of 1987. To be eligible for a restructured loan, farm borrowers must return the complex set of forms no later than 45 days from the date notice of delinquency was mailed. In Idaho, the first notices went out Nov. 14.

More than 1,800 Idaho farmers and ranchers received notices of delinquent loans from FmHA and face foreclosure if they are unable to comply with FmHA debt restructuring requirements.

EPA requires Omark cleanup

LEWISTON (AP) — Omark Industries has been ordered by the Environmental Protection Agency to clean up the effluent from its two ammunition plants into the Lewiston sewer system.

Unacceptable levels of metals including copper, lead, nickel and zinc in Omark's wastewater has been a problem for years, said Richard Parkin, chief of EPA's water compliance section at Seattle.

Parkin said the amount of metals being dumped by Omark into the system does not pose a health risk to humans, but is of concern because it could inhibit the bacteria that kill contaminants in sewage before it is released into the Clearwater River.

Bob Robichaud, pre-treatment coordinator for EPA, also said a mixture of cyanide and chlorine released by Omark into the city lines could be dangerous to city workers. Chlorine is used to destroy cyanide, and the two substances mixed incorrectly produce tear gas.

Parkin said Omark's problem was left uncorrected for so long in part because the city of Lewiston has not been enforcing the wastewater pre-treatment program.

"The city should be taking some action," he said Wednesday.

Omark has been prepared to upgrade its pretreatment system for the past year, said Darrel Inman, general manager.

"We had already committed funds and had designed (a system) to what we thought the standards were. Then we found the proposed standards were going to change and had to put the plans on hold," he said.

Lewiston was ordered by the EPA in April 1986 to arrange an approved

pretreatment program. But inspections in June 1987 and September 1988 showed that had not been accomplished.

The EPA issued a compliance order in November to develop local pollution limits and make public notice of significant polluters.

Those actions have been taken, said Urban Wessels, Lewiston's wastewater treatment plant manager.

Arraignment soon in rest-stop murder

MALAD (AP) — James Louis Holland, 48, charged with first-degree murder in a July 4, 1987, rest stop killing at the Idaho-Utah border, has been bound over to 6th District Court.

Holland, who is being held in the Bingham County Jail in Blackfoot, was bound over following a day-long preliminary hearing Wednesday before Magistrate Lowell D. Castleton.

Arraignment will be held before 6th District Judge William Woodland. Holland faces a death penalty in Utah on a similar killing. That case is on appeal.

Woodland earlier this month rescinded his acceptance of Holland's guilty plea to the murder of Karl Behm, 24, and sent the case back to magistrate court. Woodland has been ordered by the Idaho Supreme Court to show cause why he withdrew his acceptance of Holland's guilty plea, part of the plea bargain agreement that would have meant a life sentence for Holland instead of a possible death penalty.

Lujan choice draws applause

WASHINGTON — Idaho's congressional delegation gave a thumbs-up Thursday to President-elect Bush's choice of retiring Rep. Manuel Lujan, Jr., R-N.M., as Interior secretary.

Both Idaho congressmen were pleased that Bush picked a Westerner for Interior secretary, a post which Rep. Larry Craig, R-Idaho, described as "amfurd" to most Western states, including Idaho.

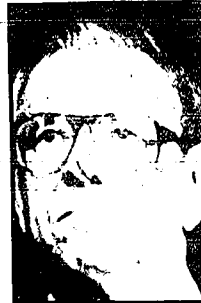
Lujan served with Craig on the Interior and Insular Affairs Committee and with Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, on the Science, Space, and Technology Committee. Lujan was the ranking Republican on both panels.

"I'm pleased by that choice. I've worked with Manny Lujan for eight years on the Interior Committee," Craig said. "He's certainly well qualified, and I think he understands all the sides of the issues."

"He's a Westerner, and I think that's important for secretary of Interior because they really are landlords over a phenomenal amount of property, and most of that is in the West," Craig said.

The new Interior secretary must

be sensitive to the balances between traditional uses of public lands for grazing, forest products and mining, and the "new, very important mandate of recreational

use and environmental sensitivity," Craig said.

"I think Lujan clearly understands that, he'll do well in that position and we'll look forward to working with him," Craig said.

Stallings, who has served on the Science, Space, and Technology Committee with Lujan since 1985, described him as "a good choice."

"He's a hard-working, dedicated public servant who represents the people in New Mexico well, and will take his job in the Interior very seriously," Stallings said from his district office in Pocatello. "You will see a good solid performer in Lujan."

"My experience is that he's not a radical, he had substance to him," Stallings said. "When Manuel said something, you could believe it."

Sen. James McClure, R-Idaho, was among a group of Western Republican senators who urged Bush to name a Westerner for the Interior post. Although a spokesman for McClure would not comment on whether Lujan was one of McClure's favored choices for the slot, the senator said that he was pleased with the announcement.

"I know Manny very, very well. I served in the House of Representatives with him for many years," McClure said from McCall. "He's very honest, very capable, and I'm looking forward to working with him."

There is still no word of Bush's choice for secretary of Energy.

Environmental group skeptical

The reception was mixed in Idaho on Thursday as President-elect George Bush picked a Republican congressman from New Mexico for his cabinet and picked the head of the World Wildlife Fund to head the Environmental Protection Agency.

Bush picked Rep. Manuel Lujan Jr. as the next secretary of the Interior. He also announced that

William Reilly would head EPA. That left only the departments of Energy and Labor to be filled by the incoming president.

"We're concerned because Mr. Lujan has a pretty strong development record," said Craig Gehrke, Boise, regional director for the Wilderness Society.

"He has cosponsored legislation to allow development on the Arctic Wildlife Refuge, and it's a pretty high priority for us to not allow

that to happen.

"But he has been willing to hear our side of the issues and it is encouraging for us that there is someone who has proven that he is willing to listen to the conservation viewpoint," Gehrke said.

Gehrke said his association was encouraged by the Reilly appointment. "He has a tremendous job ahead of him to restructure and get EPA back on track after these last eight years," he said.

Pan Am tightened up security after bomb threat 2 weeks ago

WASHINGTON (AP) — Pan American World Airways stepped up security at key airports, and U.S. embassies issued travel warnings after a threat two weeks ago that someone would "unwittingly" carry a bomb aboard a Frankfurt to New York flight, officials said Thursday.

While other causes have not been ruled out, the investigation "into" Wednesday's crash of Pan Am Flight 103 is focusing on the possibility of sabotage.

The Boeing 747 jetliner crashed into a Scottish farming town, killing all 259 aboard and at least 22 people on the ground. The flight originated in Frankfurt, West Germany and, after a plane change in London, was en route to New York when it disappeared from radar.

Aviation experts cautioned Thursday that it was too early to pinpoint a cause of the crash but said the widely scattered wreckage, witness reports of a flash of light from the jet when at high altitude and its sudden disappearance from radar at 31,000 feet all tend to support the sabotage theory.

Government and airline industry officials acknowledged that they received a threat in early December that Pan Am might be a target of a terrorist attack. The Federal Aviation Administration issued an "intelligence alert" on Dec. 5 warning that there might be a bombing attempt against a Pan Am flight

Armenia relief checks not lost

LONDON (AP) — U.S. checks donated in Britain to Armenia's earthquake victims were aboard the crashed Pan Am jumbo jet, but not a penny will be lost, a Soviet bank said Thursday.

The thousands of dollars in checks, mainly from U.S. companies in Britain, were being flown to the United States for clearance by U.S. banks on Flight 103, said Ray King, deputy general manager of Moscow Narodny Bank in London.

"There's no loss to the fund because we have microfilm copies of the checks, and all the banks are cooperating in helping to clear the checks," King said in a telephone interview.

A total of about \$5.4 million has been received by the bank in cash, checks and credit card donations since the Dec. 7 disaster in the southern Soviet republic.

from Frankfurt, West Germany.

State Department spokeswoman Phyllis Oakley said that on that day an anonymous caller told the U.S. Embassy in Helsinki that "an unidentified person in Helsinki would unwittingly take the device to Frankfurt and eventually onto the U.S.-bound flight."

Another source said the caller claimed the bomb would be carried by a woman.

Mrs. Oakley said the caller targeted Pan Am and told the embassy that individuals who would provide the device have ties to Abu Nidal, leader of a radical Palestinian faction.

The Finnish Foreign Ministry said in a statement Thursday that an Arab resident

had made several bomb threats during the year, most recently on Dec. 5, but that "in the investigation so far, no direct connection has been found between the Arab living in Finland and the air accident in question."

The statement said authorities knew the caller's identity and that he had not left Finland since Dec. 5.

White House spokesman Marlin Fitzwater said the State Department warned embassies of the threat two days after it first was made and also notified Pan Am and "appropriate police" in various parts of the world.

Flight 103 started in Frankfurt with a Boeing 727. Its passengers and their luggage

were transferred to a Boeing 747 and joined by other passengers at London's Heathrow Airport for the flight to New York. The crash occurred an hour after departure from London.

Mrs. Oakley said British authorities also were notified of the threat, but in London a spokesman for Heathrow Airport, Frances Aldridge, told reporters, "I can say categorically that we have not heard of this."

Pamela Hanton, a Pan Am spokeswoman, said in New York: "Pan Am had received notification from various sources that there was the possibility of a (terrorist) threat. ... We immediately acted and put supplementary security procedures in effect, not only at Frankfurt but at airports around the world."

She confirmed one of the warnings came from the Federal Aviation Administration, but defended the airline's decision not to further disclose the potential danger, citing a portion of the memo that directed the information to be "solely for the use of U.S. carriers and airport security personnel and may not be further disseminated without the specific approval of the director of civil aviation security."

The FAA in its alert said it was not in a position to evaluate the reliability of the report, which named "no specific terrorist

group, although it said the threat was "Middle East oriented," according to sources, who spoke on the condition that they not be identified.

According to government sources, the alert was sent to airline security officers, airport officials and specifically to Pan Am because the airline was mentioned in the threat. The alert also went to the State Department.

FAA spokesman Fred Farrar said the agency had no comment on the reported alert.

A former FAA official familiar with such warnings said that while such alerts are not infrequent, they are expected to be taken seriously. "It's more than a hint. It's a direct request to beef up security," said the former official.

As a result of the alert, airport officials at Frankfurt also stepped up security earlier this month, according to Horst Harnstein, an official at the airport.

The State Department, meanwhile, warned its embassies of the possible threat and at some embassies, including the one in Moscow, an advisory was placed on employee bulletin boards.

State Department officials said at least four of those killed in the Pan Am crash were government employees including two assigned to the U.S. Embassy in Beirut.

**Crash scars
Scots village
many ways**

LOCKERBIE, Scotland (AP) — Corpses were strewn on a golf course and children played beside twisted airplane wreckage Thursday in this village scarred physically and emotionally by the Pan Am crash.

Residents recalled whoshing noises and tremendous flames as the stricken Boeing 747 jumbo jet roared low overhead, spewing pieces over the rolling countryside and finally crashing in fragments across their streets and houses Wednesday evening.

All 259 people aboard Pan Am Flight 103 from Frankfurt to New York, via London, died and as many as 22 people were killed on the ground, some in cars hit by wreckage, officials said.

"It is beyond one's imagination. ... You have to come here to see it and to realize,"

A long, deep crater tore a black scar along a row of houses. Other homes, drenched in flaming aviation fuel, were gutted.

Survivors comforted each other, felt lucky to be alive, and tried to clean up some of the mess in the town of 2,600 people.

In a yard next to the main street lay the cover of one engine, but the fence and adjacent building were undamaged. Children bicycled around a chunk of fuselage, and the grocer boarded up his shattered store front.

Scorched pillows, lifejackets and fragments of clothing lay scattered in gardens. Chunks of metal, some as small as coins and others two feet in diameter, had sliced through roofs and shattered windows in homes and cars.

Charred dollar bills, a mud-spattered seatbelt and tattered copies of the Pan Am inflight magazine added to the melancholy scene.

Lockerbie's town hall became a makeshift morgue as firefighters recovered remains strewn about town. Eight bodies lay on a neighboring golf course, covered in tarpaulins and guarded by police.

Four miles outside town, the nose cone of the blue-and-white jumbo jet was tipped on its side in a muddy field.

"There'll be no Christmas this year as far as Lockerbie is concerned," said Bobby Scott, a builder who had just finished work Wednesday night when he heard the explosion.

He dashed out to see the jet heading toward the gas station, and watched the disaster unfold.

Iranian prime minister denies any role for his nation in crash; 2 groups claim deed

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — Iran's prime minister on Thursday denied there was an Iranian role in the fiery crash of a Pan Am jet, and he expressed regret over the incident.

Prime Minister Hussein Musavi "categorically denied any Iranian involvement" in the crash, said the official Islamic Republic News Agency, monitored in Nicolas.

Pan Am Flight 103, on its way from London

to New York after originating in Frankfurt, crashed Wednesday evening in the Scottish village of Lockerbie.

There were two claims of responsibility: one from a little-known, supposedly pro-Iranian group and one from the Abu Nidal radical Palestinian faction.

An anonymous male telephoned The Associated Press in London, identifying himself as

from The Guardians of the Islamic Revolution. He said the group had staged what he called a "heroic execution" in reprisal for the downing of an Iran Air Airbus A300 by the U.S. Navy cruiser Vincennes in July, in which 290 people were killed.

The Navy said the plane had been mistaken for an Iranian fighter.

"We are very proud," the caller said before

hanging up. As far as is known, the group surfaced only once before — last year in London, when it claimed responsibility for a car bombing in which an Iranian dissident leader was wounded.

Beyond that, nothing is known of the group, and pro-Iranian terrorists constantly change the group names they use.

Chemical weapons factory in Libya concerns Reagan

WASHINGTON (AP) — The administration is "extremely concerned" about Libya's chemical weapons factory and hasn't ruled out using military force against it, President Reagan's spokesman said.

"The president was quite clear that military action is an option. We're not ruling it out," White House spokesman Martin Fitzwater said in answer to reporters' questions about a comment Reagan made in a television interview.

"We're in communication with our allies and with NATO forces and all, and we're watching very closely that situation but even if I had made a decision, I couldn't...."

Reagan believes some homeless choose to sleep on grates, grass

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan said in an interview broadcast Thursday that some homeless people sleep on grates or on the grass from "their own choice" instead of going to shelters.

In the television interview with ABC News, Reagan also said the possibility of Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev being ousted "has to be considered" although he has seen no indication of it.

ABC's David Brinkley asked Reagan for his views on the homeless, noting that some of them sleep in a park about 200 yards from the Oval Office, where the interview was taped on Wednesday.

"Doesn't that go back — that there are always going to be people — they make it their own choice for staying out there."

"There are shelters in virtually every city and shelters here and those people still prefer to out there on the grates or the lawn or going into one of those shelters," he said.

advocate for the homeless who runs a shelter in Washington, reported during a bitterly cold spell earlier this month that people had to be turned away from shelters already filled beyond capacity.

Asked whether the opposition to Gorbachev in the Soviet Union was strong enough to force him out, Reagan said that "up until now the government of that huge country or nation is the communist party, which is really a tiny elite of the population of the Soviet Union."

"But they literally appoint, so it is possible for — and we've seen it in the past — Soviet leaders to suddenly be ousted. I don't see any indication yet or threat of that, but I think it's something that has to be considered if you look at their past history."

In the hour-long interview, the president also suggested that "maybe our founding fathers made something of a mistake in the method of representation," by which state legislators redraw congressional district lines after each

century. "I think that a bipartisan citizens committee representing both parties and top-ranking citizens would perhaps do a job that is based on the needs of the district," he said, repeating criticism that the present system is too partisan.

Reagan thanks relief volunteers

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan paid tribute to American volunteers who have assisted in Soviet earthquake rescue efforts, saying that because of them "the Armenians have not had to face this tragedy alone."

Reagan met in the Roosevelt Room of the White House with such relief workers as firefighters, physicians and other volunteers, as well as with employees of the Agency for International Development who coordinated U.S. efforts in Soviet Armenia this month.

Higher drinking age lessens traffic deaths

CHICAGO (AP) — States that have raised their drinking age to 21 can expect a significant drop in drunken driving fatalities among 19-and 20-year-olds, says a researcher who studied traffic deaths in Tennessee.

"Raising the drinking age to 21 has a dramatic, immediate and lasting effect on the number of fatalities of 19-and 20-year-olds," said Dr. Michael Decker of Vanderbilt University School of Medicine in Nashville, whose report appeared in Friday's Journal of the American Medical Association.

He found that the fatality rate in single-vehicle, nighttime crashes involving drivers ages 19 and 20 years old declined 38 percent in the 26 months after Tennessee raised its drinking age from 19 to 21.

In another JAMA report Friday, two studies found that reducing the use of seat belts significantly reduced injuries and deaths and that accident victims who don't wear the seat belts pay nearly triple the health care bills of those who do.

Those studies examined accidents in North Carolina from 1981 to 1983 and accident victims taken to the

trauma units of four Chicago-area hospitals.

The Tennessee study examined statistics on drivers ages 15 to 21 in 1980 through 1986, said Decker, an assistant professor of preventive medicine.

"There's absolutely no reason to think the results would be substantially different in other states — particularly now that there's some uniformity in the state drinking age laws," he said in an interview Wednesday.

Motor vehicle accidents cause slip on slap at homosexuals

DALLAS (AP) — A judge apologized Thursday for a "poor choice of words" in saying he gave a killer a lighter sentence because the victims were "queers."

State District Judge Jack Hampton, whose remarks prompted outrage from gay and civil liberties organizations and demands for his removal from the bench, made the apology at the Dallas County Courthouse.

"I did not mean to condemn the homosexual community generally and

most 40 percent of deaths among youths 15 to 21, and drunken driving is involved about half the time, the study said.

Drinking ages varied across the country until Congress passed a law in 1984 requiring states to raise the limit to 21 or lose highway funds. Wyoming was the last state to comply raising its drinking age as of July 1.

Tennessee's drinking age was 21 until 1971, when it was reduced to 18. The limit was raised to 19 in 1979 and 21 on Aug. 1, 1984.

I used a poor choice of words and I'm sorry about that," Hampton said.

William Wayburn, president of the Dallas Gay Alliance, said Hampton's apology was not enough and pushed for his resignation.

Hampton told the Dallas Times Herald last week that he sentenced 18-year-old Richard Lee Bednarski to 30 years in prison instead of the maximum life sentence on Nov. 26 in part because Bednarski's two victims were homosexuals.

Feds reveal rescue plan for 15 savings and loans

WASHINGTON (AP) — Federal regulators Thursday announced a plan to merge 15 insolvent savings and loan institutions in Texas, bringing to 175 the number of failed S&Ls which have been rescued nationwide this year.

The 15 Texas S&Ls will be acquired by CFSB Corp. Inc., a holding company headed by James M. Fail of Phoenix, Ariz. Fail agreed to put up \$120 million to acquire the insolvent institutions.

The Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corp., which guarantees deposits at 3,000 S&Ls, will provide assistance amounting to \$1.65 billion. The transaction was part of the Southwest Plan launched in May to address problems at 109 failed S&Ls in Texas, where financial institutions have been hard hit by depressed real estate and oil industries.

The latest rescue package brings the total of failed institutions which

have been closed or merged to 175 nationwide and 69 in Texas.

"We now have consolidated more than half of the 109 Texas thrifts that were insolvent when we started the Southwest Plan and we are rapidly moving toward our goal of completing the work in Texas by the end of the 1989 fiscal year (next Sept. 30)," said M. Danny Wall, chairman of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board, which oversees the FSILIC fund.

The institutions Fail acquired will re-open Friday as Consolidated Federal Bank FSB. Consolidated will initially operate all 59 of the branches of the former institutions, the bank board said.

Fail is chairman of Lifeshares Service Co. and several other insurance companies.

Woman dies trying to save her 2 dogs

PITTSBURGH (AP) — A woman died of injuries suffered when she back into her burning home Dec. 3 in a failed attempt to save her two pet heads.

Mae J. Stapp, 67, died at Mercy Hospital on Wednesday of burns over 52 percent of her body. Hurling over the arteries and diabetes contributed to her death, said James Gregr, chief deputy coroner for Allegheny County.

"According to the nephew, she wasn't burned or injured when he took her out of the house the first time. She was safe, but couldn't leave the dogs inside," said fire Capt. John Bauer.

Israel forms unity government

JERUSALEM (AP) — Israel's rival Likud and Labor parties formed their "second successive" national-unity government Thursday to meet the challenge of the more moderate PLO image and the Palestinian declaration of independence.

Developments in the international arena and challenges we are facing require us to bridge our differences to overcome the obstacles and dangers we face.

The 23-member Cabinet, led by Shamir of the conservative Likud bloc, was presented to the Knesset for ceremonial approval. Two Labor members and one from Likud abstained in protest.

A coalition was necessary because neither major party won control of

the 121-member Knesset in the Nov. 1 election. Likud got 40 seats, the center-left Labor Party 39 and smaller parties the other 41.

Similarly indecisive results in the 1984 election led to the first coalition, in which the two major parties were equal partners. This one is led by Likud.

In his speech to the Knesset, Shamir called making peace the "first and foremost objective."

He urged Palestinians in the occupied West Bank and Gaza Strip to end their year-old uprising so they and Israel can create conditions for a peaceful coexistence, freedom and prosperity for you and your children.

The prime minister again ruled out talks with the Palestine Liberation Organization and said negotia-

tions should be based on the U.S.-mediated Camp David accords of 1978, which provide for direct talks between Israel and Jordan and the Palestinians. The PLO and Arab nations want an international conference under U.N. sponsorship.

Labor Party leader Shimon Peres, who will be deputy premier and finance minister, supports an international conference.

He also has recommended elections in the occupied territories to choose Palestinians who would negotiate with Israel.

Peres was foreign minister in the outgoing government, but Moshe Arens of Likud has the portfolio in the new one. Holdovers include Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin of Labor and Industry Minister Ariel Sharon of Likud.

Namibia may be independent

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — South Africa signed an agreement Thursday to end its 73-year control of South-West Africa and make the continent's last colony the independent nation of Namibia in 1990.

Foreign Minister R.F. Botha put his signature on the accord at U.N. headquarters along with the foreign ministers of Cuba and Angola, which pledges to send home 50,000 Cuban troops stationed in Angola.

"By signing this agreement we have decided not to shoot it out; we have decided to talk," Botha said. It calls for a one-year transition to Namibian independence beginning April 1.

A year of U.S.-mediated negotiations led to the agreements. Secretary of State George P. Shultz, U.N. Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar and other diplomats attended the signing.

Missing from the ceremony was Bert Carlsson, U.N. commissioner for Namibia. The 50-year-old Swedish diplomat was killed Wednesday on the Pan Am jetliner that crashed in Scotland.

Shultz led the dignitaries in a minute of silence for Carlsson.

After the signing ceremony, Shultz said: "The regional settlement concluded here today represents a momentous turning point in the history of southern Africa. With the independence of Namibia, Africa's last colonial question will have been resolved."

The guns fall silent across the borders of southwestern Africa, the world will look to the nations of that vast region to turn to the resolution of their pressing internal matters through peaceful means," he said, referring to the civil war between Angola's Marxist government and rebels supported by the United States and South Africa.

The governments and individuals gathered in this place have truly given the world a special gift," Shultz declared.

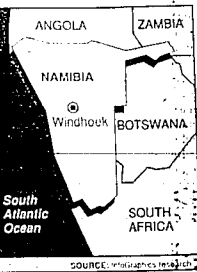

Walesa wants union legalized first

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — Lech Walesa expressed satisfaction Thursday with Communist Party statements on apparent willingness to change the labor union system, but said he wants Solidarity legalized before talking with officials.

It is a signal (from the party), but we are saying once again that without Solidarity, without delegating Solidarity, there is no possibility of agreement," Walesa told The Associated Press from his home in Gdansk.

At a meeting Wednesday of the party Central Committee, Polish leader Gen. Wojciech Jaruzelski replaced six hard-line Politburo members with seven younger pragmatists and prominent party liberal Stanislaw Ciszek.

Solidarity adviser Andrzej Stelmachowski said: "As a first step it was a very positive one because the group

of hard-liners seems to be far weaker now than before. Therefore the climate for further steps ... is far better."

In another effort to accelerate reforms, parliament Thursday considered a package of bills that would change the Polish economy dramatically.

If passed, the bills will allow anyone to start a private business, liberalize foreign investment in Poland, reform banking and permit free exchange of zlotys for foreign currency.

Deputy Prime Minister Ireneusz Sekula introduced the package as the basis "for freedom, equality and competition in the economy."

"The duty of the socialist state is to assure people equal opportunity. ... Further possibilities should depend on their individual achievements."

This is the only way one should understand justice," he said.

At the party meeting Wednesday, Prime Minister Mieczyslaw F. Rakowski praised Walesa's recent statements and said he judged the Solidarity leader a reliable and moderate partner for talks.

In the clearest signal that the party may lift its seven-year ban of the independent trade union, Rakowski told the committee to poll local party members on Walesa and Solidarity, which was crushed by a 1981 military crackdown and outlawed the following year.

Rakowski told them to return their answers at the 230-member body's next session, in mid-January. "Your answer ... will decide about what we will do. And what we do will decide the future of socialism in Poland," he said.

Soviet Union struggles with relief

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviet authorities have evacuated 92,000 people from earthquake-stricken northern Armenia, but they are still struggling to deliver millions of tons of relief materials, according to reports Thursday.

A commission of the ruling Politburo found that rail services in particular are "a bottleneck slowing measures to overcome the effects of the natural calamity," the official Soviet news agency Tass said.

The commission ordered all possible transport mobilized to carry a shipment of trailers to the disaster area for use as medical stations.

The official Soviet news agency

Tass increased the official count of "ruined" villages to 300 and said 58 of them were obliterated by the quake. It also said about 10 percent of the livestock in the rural areas died.

About 55,000 people died in the Dec. 7 quake that registered 6.9 on the Richter scale. Thousands were injured and more than 500,000 left homeless.

Freight traffic to Armenia is increasing daily as building materials join the relief supplies pouring into the tiny mountainous Soviet republic on the border with Turkey. But hauling the cargo from the Armenian capital of Yerevan to the city of Leninakan and other stricken areas

is still a problem, Tass said. Rail service near the disaster area is erratic; unloading of freight cars is quickening, but still not fast enough, even at 1,633 cars a day, and at least 2,000 cars must pass through daily, it said.

Armenian children, meanwhile, took up their books again in 23 temporary schools in the Crimea, hundreds of miles from their ruined homes, Tass reported.

Psychologists are working with victims to ease the pain of their experience, and warned that children especially could suffer for years to come, according to the labor newspaper *Trud*.

Soviets recycle tank engines

MOSCOW (AP) — The Soviet Union plans to recycle engines from the 10,000 army tanks being withdrawn from Europe for use in the lagging domestic economy, the official news agency Tass reported Thursday.

Fuel tanker trucks and cargo trailers attached to the six tank divisions being disbanded also will be transferred to civilian use, Tass said, quoting Maj. Gen. Yuri Lebedev of the armed forces general staff.

President Mikhail S. Gorbachev told the United Nations on Dec. 7 that Soviet armed forces would be cut by 500,000 soldiers in the next two years to show the West that its intentions are defensive rather than offensive.

The reductions include six tank divisions on the front line with NATO, in Hungary, Czechoslovakia and East Germany.

Gorbachev has said repeatedly that the Soviet Union must concentrate its resources on domestic problems. Soviet media previously have reported plans to shift certain military factories to the production of badly needed consumer goods.

Last spring, a factory in Odessa reportedly began to convert missile platforms into 60-ton construction cranes, as the Soviet Union started dismantling SS-20 rockets.

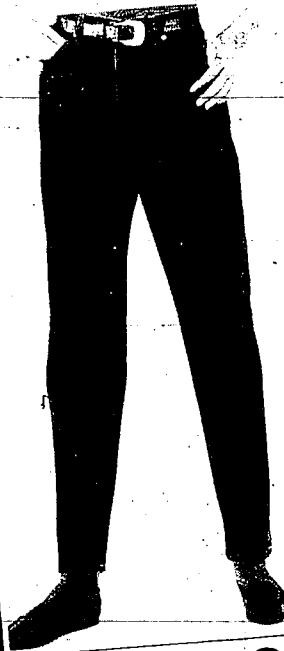

Nation's homeless look for shelter during holidays

Many of the nation's growing number of homeless may find no room at the shelter this Christmas, meaning-home for the holidays could be under a bridge, over a steam vent or in a cardboard box.

Boston guarantees a bed. Arizona workers to make shelter available by Christmas Eve, and a celebration in a heated tent is planned for the homeless in front of the Capitol on Christmas Eve. But the nation's capital has only 2,500 slots for the 10,000 to 15,000 with no bed of their own.

California Gov. George Deukmejian last month authorized counties to continue to use armories as shelters under a program started last year. Estimates of the number of homeless there range from 100,000 to 200,000.

"California may be the place of year-round sunshine in the eyes of our Eastern friends, but when you have no roof over your head, even a California winter can be cruel and punishing," Deukmejian said.

In New York City, the estimated number of homeless has increased 25 percent during the last year with the total estimated between 80,000 and 90,000; in Portland, Ore., the number rose 10 to 20 percent each year this decade.

There's been a steady increase of about 25 percent a year that hasn't changed in six years, said Keith Summers of the Coalition for the Homeless in New York City.

In Oklahoma City, there are an estimated 17,000 homeless and no state or city-run shelters. In Phoenix, with 6,000 to 9,000 homeless, Mary Orton, director of Central Arizona Shelter Services, said there are only about 1,000 beds.

The remainder "sleep on the streets, in parks, in their cars, under bushes, anywhere they can," Ms. Orton said. Arizona Gov. Rose Mofford tried to make a National Guard armory or other state buildings available for Phoenix-area homeless but was advised she could not legally use state emergency funds to pay for the operation.

The governor will find some other way to make more beds available by Christmas-Eve, said Vada Manager, her press secretary. Christine Byrd, regional director of the National Coalition for the Homeless in Oklahoma City said a December report from a governor's task force put the total for the state at 35,000 and 17,000 for the city.

Ms. Byrd said 48 percent are families, but that because of Oklahoma's location at the nation's center, poor families going from the West Coast to the East or vice versa run out of gas or have car trouble, she said.

The coalition estimated the number of homeless nationally at as many as 3 million. Boston seems to have the distinction of being one of the few cities where the number of homeless has not drastically increased in the last two or three years. In both 1987 and 1988, the city's estimate of homeless was under 3,500.

"Whoever needs a bed gets one," says Ann Maguire, executive director of the Boston Emergency Shelter Commission. If there is no room at one shelter, the city provides a van or police car to get the person to a shelter with room.

Baloney Joe's, a Portland, Ore., shelter for homeless men, is "so full we're stacking people on top of each other," said Gene Ediger of the Burnside Community Council, a private agency for the homeless. He said the number of homeless has gone up 10 to 20 percent each year of the 1980s.

In Philadelphia, the city has started daily cleanups of a subway concourse where homeless people set up boxes, mattresses and blankets. Police have not stopped homeless people from returning.

Christmas is a time of enlightenment, but when you're homeless, said Sister Mary Scullion, who runs a program for mentally ill homeless women in Philadelphia.

Number of freezing deaths doubles in past 10 years

ATLANTA — The number of freezing deaths reported in the United States has more than doubled in a decade, possibly because of the nation's homeless problem, the national Centers for Disease Control said Thursday.

In 1985, the latest year for which complete statistics are available, 1,010 people died from exposure to the cold, a 137 percent increase from the 427 deaths reported in 1976, the CDC said.

The vast majority of cold-exposure deaths are technically because of hypothermia — decreased body temperature, or freezing to death.

Although more research remains to be done, the numbers strongly suggest that more and more Americans are dying from the cold, the CDC said.

"It's either increased cold ... which is unlikely, or it's more people exposed to more intense or more frequent stresses from the cold," said CDC researcher Dr. Edwin Kilbourne.

He said that while it is possible that many of the deaths are due to inadequate home heating, part of the problem is the significant number of people who have no shelter at all to call their own.

A person who has to sleep outdoors, they certainly run a higher risk of problems like hypothermia," Kilbourne said.

Social service officials have said the number of homeless has risen in recent years and has estimated the national total at up to 3 million.

The CDC said special attention should be paid to proper nutrition and home heating for the elderly, shelter for the homeless and precautions for young people outdoors, such as skiers and hikers.

Kilbourne said more research is needed to determine just who is freezing to death: homeless people, who are typically middle-aged men, or older people, less able to withstand cold conditions, possibly living with insufficient heat.

In the past, at least in certain cases, hypothermia has been thought of as a problem of middle-aged men alcoholics ... a "street person." We really don't know if that remains the profile," he said.

People 60 and older are particularly susceptible to hypothermia and account, for more than half of all such deaths, according to previous studies. Infants are also at high risk, although hypothermia deaths are rare in children.

Questions reliability of bidder

County rejects offer of cheaper coverage

TWIN FALLS — County commissioners have opted for an insurance package they feel more comfortable with even though it costs \$35,000 more than one providing more coverage with lower deductibles, commissioners and insurance brokers say.

We're in awe," said Lynn Hill of Penco, a Boise insurance firm that offered a lower bid to the county from the Hartford Insurance Co. That's 35,000 more dollars out of taxpayer's pockets for reasons unknown.

Commissioners renewed the county's insurance contract this year with Idaho Counties Reciprocal Management Program for \$173,000, or about 27 percent more than the \$138,000 Hartford plan.

County Commissioners say they did so out of loyalty to ICAMP and fear that Hartford, like insurance companies during the insurance crisis of 1985-86, could pull out at any time leaving the county without insurance.

Jeff Davis of Penco said his company submitted bids to nearly all counties in the state on behalf of Hartford, which through Penco already covers several Idaho cities.

Unlike other insurance companies in 1985-86 which dumped cities and counties all over the country, Hartford increased its city and county clientele, with premiums rising to about \$150 million nationwide.

What puzzles us is they're making an emotional decision and not a business decision," Davis said. The bottom line is that Hartford costs less, has higher liability limits and lower deductibles, he said.

Penco and ICAMP's packages both come with \$2,500 deductibles for general, law enforcement and public officials errors and omission's liability. Hartford's liability coverage has a \$2 million cap, which is twice that of the management group.

Hartford does not have a deductible for auto liability, while the management group's is \$500. Hartford would have paid claims for injuries that occurred before their coverage began without additional cost, Davis said.

If the county had gone with Hartford, and later decided to end its contract, Hartford would have paid for injury that occurred during its coverage period but not reported until later.

The county bought a "claims-made" policy which typically pays injury claims during the coverage period when the damage occurred, but not after. The management group complements its coverage with an extended reporting period of two years and up to three years to settle claims.

Hill said that leaves the county vulnerable to claims filed after the period, which happens in counties as big as Twin Falls.

Boy killed at substation was 'out of control', says witness

HAILEY — Seven-year-old Patrick Clement, who died last year when he crawled onto equipment at an Idaho Power Co. substation, was "out of control," his school counselor testified Wednesday.

Lana Taylor, who counseled Patrick from October 1986 to May 1987, described the boy's behavioral problems, on an ascending scale of 1-10, as "seven or eight." She testified that he started a fire at the Kiddie Corral, a Hailey day-care center, and didn't seem to realize the severity of the act, even after police talked with him about it.

It didn't faze him," Taylor read from notes she had written at the time.

The boy had to be referred to psychiatric counseling because of serious behavioral problems, she said.

Joseph and Cheri Clement are suing Idaho Power for negligence, alleging the company did not properly secure the substation from entry. Patrick was "electrocuted" when he climbed onto an oil switch at the substation.

Wednesday, in the first full day of testimony by defense witnesses, Idaho Power attorney James Risch attempted to portray Patrick Clement as a child not easily controlled.

Dagmar Salmon, director of the Blaine County School District's gifted and talented program, testified that Patrick was "very bright," with an intellectual capacity of a 13-year-old. Patrick was enrolled in Salmon's gifted and talented program at Bellevue Elementary and had an extremely high IQ of 144, according to tests.

R. Keith Roark, the Clements' attorney, asked Salmon under cross-examination whether behavioral problems were common among children of high intelligence.

Yes, Salmon said.

Roark also asked, just because he assimilated curriculum at a 13-year level, doesn't mean you taught him about his community, does it?

No, Salmon answered.

"You didn't teach him about transformers and oil switches, did you?" Roark asked.

No, Salmon said.

Taylor said Patrick told her in one session, "my problem is minding my mom." In Taylor's notes, she had remarked that Patrick was running over his mother, meaning Cheri Clement had little control over her son.

INEL reports nitric acid spill

TWIN FALLS — About 180 gallons of nitric acid was spilled at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory Wednesday afternoon.

The acid was inadvertently diverted to an outdoor percolation pond at the Idaho Chemical Processing Plant about 5 p.m. Wednesday, said Nick Nichols, spokesman for Westinghouse Idaho Nuclear Co. Inc.

INEL is situated over the Snake River Plain Aquifer, from which most of the Magic Valley draws its water. But Westinghouse officials said the acid is not an environmental hazard because it is mixed with a large amount of water that goes into the percolation pond every day.

Maintenance workers had worked on the system earlier in the day and a valve had been left open. The acid was being transferred from the process area in Building 601 to a holding tank.

Instead of flowing into the tank, the acid ran into a drain and then into the Chemical Plant's service waste water system. The waste water system drains into the percolation pond.

The incident did not include any release of radioactivity, Nichols said. No one was injured.

"We've not had an inadvertent transfer of uranium-bearing solution in several years because of tightened safety precautions," Nichols said.

Nitric acid is one of the acids used at the Chemical Plant to dissolve spent nuclear fuel during reprocessing to extract enriched uranium. Nitric acid also is used in decontaminating equipment in "hot cells" — heavily shielded rooms where highly radioactive materials are handled by remote control.

Officials will critique the incident to learn what happened and why it happened. Corrective action will be taken in the form of changed or new procedures to prevent future releases, Nichols said.

Though not regarded as serious, the accident was significant enough to report, Nichols said. State and federal environmental officials have been notified, he said.

Rupert faces rising water rate

RUPERT — The City Council likely will discuss during January how to pay for a water rate increase by the Minidoka Irrigation District.

City Clerk Loretta Klingenberg gave the council this week a letter from the district stating rates are going up \$3 an acre, about a \$3,500 increase for the city.

Mayor Bill Whitton said after the meeting he's not sure how the city will pay for the increase.

"What we have to look at is whether we put a hold on capital improvements and the purchase of needed supplies or whether we find some way to make a modest increase in rates," Whitton said.

Whitton said he is more concerned with the nature of the notice than the amount involved. The increase was unexpected and comes just three months following the adoption of a new budget, meaning the city will have to make special arrangements to deal with the increase.

He said he will suggest at the next meeting of the Legislative Committee of the Association of Idaho Cities, of which he is a member, that some kind of coordinating group be organized to keep government agencies informed about possible changes affecting each other.

"I think all of the government agencies need some kind of program put together where they have an integrated program of advising each other of increases that are anticipated," Whitton said.

In other matters, council members agreed to offer city funds for one-third the cost of materials to build sidewalks to Big Valley School. The city also will offer its design services.

One mother suggested that the Parents-Teachers Association have a fund-raiser to help defray some of the expenses of the sidewalks.

The council accepted a bid by Woodstone Inc. of \$13,355 for remodeling the city's electric building. Bids will still be taken for a new utility pickup and two police vehicles.

The current sewer system will be updated with larger pumps to accommodate the extra flow during peak months of the year, Whitton told the council. The \$1,061 million project will be funded by grants from the state Department of Energy, the Environmental Protection Agency and the city.

In other matters, Rupert's Neptune swimming pool must have a new boiler, at an estimated cost of \$25,000. The council will agree to expenditures for the existing facility, as long as they dovetail into a proposed future indoor pool and recreation complex.

Andrus delivers Buhl grant

BUHL — Gov. Cecil Andrus personally delivered a check for \$352,450 to the city of Buhl Thursday.

Meanwhile, said Mallory, the market for baked beans has steadily increased. Since Idaho produces the ingredients for baked beans and the west coast has a solid demand for beans, "it makes good business sense" to start bean production in Buhl, he said.

"This expansion will make sure Pet remains a vital part of the Buhl economy for the years to come," Mallory said. The packaging materials also will be from Idaho, he said.

Andrus said Pet officials have shown confidence in Idaho and its people. They know the strength and dedication of Idaho people," he said.

About 40 new jobs will be added to Pet's operations

Window plant pays chamber

TWIN FALLS — The long process of getting a window-manufacturing plant settled in Twin Falls ended Thursday with a \$442,500 check.

Harold Thomas, chairman of TJ International's board, presented the check to the Greater Twin Falls Area Chamber of Commerce. The chamber presented Thomas the deed to the land.

The company announced in September 1987 that it planned to locate a wood-window plant at the old Kollwood plant south of Twin Falls. The plant is operating with 24 associates — TJ International's term for its employees — and could expand to 100 employees in 1989, Thomas said.

The plant could employ 300 to 400 people if expansion proceeds as TJ International plans.

TJ International is the new name for Trus Joist. The September 1988 name change also included a change in name for its window-manufacturing subsidiary from Norco Windows Inc. to Design Master Corp.

The company is targeting its wood-framed windows at a Southern California market.

"We expect to get a great penetration," Thomas said.

A complex arrangement of incentives persuaded the company to locate in Twin Falls. The city issued \$850,000 in bonds for the chamber to buy the building. The chamber will pay the city back.

It's the first time an Idaho city has made such a move authorized by a 1982 law, according to the Idaho Department of Employment.

The \$442,500 was turned over to the city at

NBC joins cable TV to air Olympics

NEW YORK NBC Sports signed an agreement Thursday with Cablevision Systems Corporation to put the Olympics on U.S. cable TV for the first time in a pooling of television resources worth an estimated \$300 million.

The agreement could create 130,000 hours of pay-per-view coverage from the 1992 Barcelona Summer Games in addition to NBC's planned 160 hours over the commercial airwaves, NBC Sports President Arthur Watson said.

Although neither the network nor Cablevision would release financial details, it was reported earlier this month that NBC was trying to lay off on cable television about \$75 million of its \$400 million total payment for the Barcelona Games.

"We had offers from cable interests that approximated that number," Watson said in a conference call. "It's in that arena."

"It had to be substantial, if you look at the overall bid," Cablevision executive vice president Marc Lustgarten told The Associated Press. "We're taking the risk as part of it."

The total package also includes the combining of Cablevision's current programming and NBC's Consumer News and Business Channel (CNBC), which is expected to begin operation in the spring. The agreement gives NBC a delivery system for CNBC, which will carry sports on the weekends.

In addition, NBC made a commitment to Cablevision to help develop SportsChannel America into a national cable sports network with both national and regional events.

"The idea is to create regionalized channels which will offer programming that's the closest thing to your hometown team," Lustgarten said.

Lethridge gets taste of Eagles' intensity, 115-55

TWIN FALLS — Percentage-wise, it has to rank as the biggest dividend a College of Southern Idaho team has ever paid its fans.

We're talking cash, fans. For a back-in-hand admission price, about 1,100 fans got an immediate 33 percent dividend in the form of a Wendy's hamburger when they thumped Lethridge College of Canada 115-55 in a pre-Christmas-exhibition game Thursday night.

Wendy's offers a single burger to any attending fan on those nights the Eagles can limit a foe to less than 60.

For a long while it didn't appear this would be dividend night as Lethridge hit 16 points in the first eight minutes of the second half to climb to 45 points. But the visitors managed just 10 points over the last 11:50 of the contest, a lesson in patience that Rich Birrell's son probably won't let his father forget as they left with six minutes to play.

There was little chance that Lethridge was going to beat the nationally third-ranked Golden Eagles on their home floor. Sophomore Kenny Jarvis got the charge started with six of CSI's first 10 points and a 10-2 lead. Sergio Gomes then rang in a pair of three-pointers and with 0:19 left in the first half, CSI had sealed the matter of the victory by running up a 39-10 advantage.

The victory allows CSI to take a 13-0 record into a brief five-day Christmas layoff. The Eagles return to the court next Friday night to entertain Big Bend, Wash.

"We kinda set the goal of hiding them under 60," Coach Fred Trinkle said afterward. "But we got off to a shaky start in the second half and when they hit all those early puts I figured that was gone."

"I didn't feel they were going to get to 100 ourselves because I thought they would roll the ball over offensively with a lot of patience and that just wouldn't be that many offensive opportunities for us," he continued.

"Coaches have a way of mising up combinations to hold down the score a little, too," he admitted. "I'm sure this bunch has always shown the ability to explode and get a lot of points in a hurry. That's what happened tonight and that's how we got over 100."

Ernest Byner prepares by not thinking about big playoff fumble

CLEVELAND — Lethridge bring out the best and the worst in Ernest Byner, owner of Cleveland's top postseason rushing performer as well as the most famous fumble in team history.

"I'm trying not to think about all that," Byner said as he prepped for Saturday's AFC wild-card game against the Houston Oilers. "I'll try to think about having that big game, I'll just end up causing problems for myself."

Byner's last playoff memory is a dark one. The Browns went in the verge of tying last season's AFC championship game in Denver when he fumbled the ball away at the Broncos' 3-yard line, stopping Cleveland one game short of the Super Bowl for the second straight year.

Yet, Byner might more hilarily be remembered as the man who broke Jim Brown's 21-year-old team record for rushing in a playoff game. Byner ran for 161 yards in a loss to the Miami Dolphins in January 1988 smashing Brown's record of 114 yards set in 1964 against Baltimore.

Byner surpassed Brown's mark again in January of this year, running for 122 yards in a divisional playoff victory over the Indianapolis Colts. And in the loss to Denver the following week, he was superb until the closing seconds, running 43 times for 67 yards and catching seven passes for 120 yards. He scored two touchdowns.

He realizes his past heroics, and his blunder, will be in the spotlight again Saturday.

"You don't want to get to hyped up, but it's hard not to at this time of year," he said.

Though ticket sales for Saturday's

game initially were sluggish, Byner said fans around Cleveland are regaining the playoff spirit they showed during the past two seasons.

"I went out shopping yesterday and I got stopped about a dozen times by people wishing me well," he said. The Oilers, meanwhile, say they aren't having any trouble at all keeping the game in perspective. The two teams, rivals in the AFC Central Division, played twice already this season, with each team winning at home.

Cleveland will host the rubber match because it had a superior division record. Both teams went 10-6 overall during the regular season.

"When you play Cleveland, you really don't even look at it as a playoff game," said quarterback Warren Moon. "You look at it as a divisional opponent. We know each other so well, it's just going to come down to out-executing each other and making the big plays. That's where they made the game last week. They made more big plays than we did in the later stages of the game."

The Browns defeated Houston 28-23 Sunday, overcoming a 16-point deficit with three straight touchdowns in the second half. The Oilers, who could have eliminated Cleveland from the playoffs and clinched home-field advantage for the wild-card game, have been replaying that loss in their minds this week.

"When we went up 22-7, if we could have held them on the next series, we would have been in better position," Moon said. "But they went on a long drive and scored, and I think that's where it started to get away. If we could have gotten the ball back and scored one more time, I think they might have given up."

Neither team ran the ball well, at

least partly because of poor footing on the cold, snowy field. Temperatures in the 40s were expected Saturday, though rain may make the field slippery once again.

"I don't think the conditions were a factor," Byner said. "Our defense did

a good job against them. When we had the ball, Houston was doing a lot of stunting at the line and really clogging things up in the middle."

"We have to be able to get outside some to stop them from clogging the middle."

Independence Bowl offers UTEP, S. Mississippi match

SHREVEPORT, La. — The Southern Mississippi and Texas-El Paso defenses ran through a dizzying variety of fronts one last time Thursday, all designed to stop what promises to be a high-scoring Independence Bowl.

"We won't do anything we haven't done before," UTEP defensive coordinator Mike Church said. "We're just going to do a lot more of it."

UTEP, 10-2, meets Southern Mississippi, 9-2, Friday night in the 13th annual Independence Bowl.

The game pits two offenses which scored often this year and two defenses which gave yards freely.

UTEP scored 49 of 50 times inside the 25-yard line and has averaged 55.5 points per game. Quarterback Pat Hegarty threw for 2,529 yards and 17 touchdowns and leads an offense that has averaged 43.3 yards per game.

"The key is we have to vary our approach," Southern Mississippi defensive coordinator Ellis Johnson said. "I don't think we're good enough to do just one thing. We've got to do a lot of different things and

not let them know when we're going to do them."

The UTEP defense, meanwhile, allowed an average of 420.5 yards per game, but kept opponents to an average of 19.8 points per game.

Southern Mississippi quarterback Brett Favre leads a Golden Eagles offense that averaged 187.3 yards rushing and 289 yards passing per game. Favre threw for 2,271 yards and 16 touchdowns.

The Golden Eagles defense was victimized the most through the air, allowing an average of 166 yards rushing, but 243.3 yards per game passing.

"Our defensive guys have always risen to the occasion when faced with a good offense and we hope this is one of those occasions," Southern Mississippi coach Curley Hallman said. "I don't know how many points it's going to take to win. I hope our kicking game is good and our defense turns the ball over to us several times."

UTEP's offense will be hampered by the loss of leading rusher John Harvey, one of two Miners who did not make the trip from El Paso. Harvey, UTEP's all-time leading rusher,

rushed for 751 yards and 10 touchdowns this year, despite nagging ankle and knee injuries.

UTEP sports information director Eddie Mullens said Harvey didn't make the trip because of an ankle injury. An El Paso television station, however, reported this week that Harvey failed an NCAA drug test. UTEP athletic director Brad Hovius has refused comment on the report.

UTEP players also have had to deal this week with the uncertainty surrounding the UTEP coaching situation. Miners coach Bob Sull accepted to head coaching position at Missouri and Hovius had hoped to name a replacement before the game.

Hovius said Wednesday that the top three contenders to replace Sull removed themselves from consideration this week and a replacement wouldn't be named until after Christmas.

"Hopefully, the players are just interested in playing and aren't worrying about the coaching change," Sull said. "We have a lot of seniors on the team and I think they're excited about playing."

NBC joins cable TV to air Olympics

NEW YORK — NBC Sports signed an agreement Thursday with Cablevision Systems Corporation to put the Olympics on U.S. cable TV for the first time in a pooling of television resources worth an estimated \$500 million.

The agreement could create 150,000 hours of pay-per-view coverage from the 1992 Barcelona Summer Games in addition to NBC's planned 160 hours over the commercial airwaves, NBC Sports President Arthur Watson said.

Although neither the network nor Cablevision would release financial details, it was reported earlier this month that NBC was trying to lay off on cable television about \$75 million of its \$401 million total payment for the Barcelona Games.

"We had offers from cable interests that approximated that number," Watson said in a conference call. "It's in that arena."

"It had to be substantial, if you look at the overall bid," Cablevision executive vice president Marc Lustgarten told The Associated Press. "We're taking the risk as part of it."

The total package also includes the combining of Cablevision's current programming and NBC's Consumer News and Business Channel (CNBC), which is expected to begin operation in the spring. The agreement gives NBC a delivery system, for CNBC, which will carry sports on the weekends.

In addition, NBC made a commitment to Cablevision to help develop SportsChannel America into a national cable sports network with both national and regional events.

"The idea is to create regionalized channels which will offer programming that's the closest thing to your hometown team," Lustgarten said.

CSI basketball pays off for fans

Lethridge gets taste of Eagles' intensity, 115-55

TWIN FALLS — Percentagewise, it has to rank as the biggest dividend a College of Southern Idaho team has ever paid its fans.

We're talking cash, fans. For a buck-a-head admission price, about 1,100 fans got an immediate 30 percent dividend in the form of a Wendy's hamburger when they thumped Lethridge College of Canada 115-55 in a pre-Christmas exhibition game Thursday night.

Wendy's offers a single burger to any attending fan on those nights the Eagles can limit a foe to less than 60.

For a long while it didn't appear this would be dividend night, as Lethridge hit 16 points in the first eight minutes of the second half to climb to 45 points. But the visitors managed just 10 points over the last 11:50 of the contest, a lesson in patience that Rich Birrell's son probably won't let his father forget as they left with six minutes to play.

There was little chance that Lethridge was going to beat the nationally third-ranked Golden Eagles on their home floor. Sophomore/Kenny Jarvis got the charge started with six of CSI's first 10 points and a 10-2 lead. Sergio Gomes then rang in a pair of three-pointers and with 10:19 left in the first half, CSI had settled the matter of the victory by running up a 30-10 advantage.

The victory allows CSI to take a 13-0 record into a brief five-day Christmas layoff. The Eagles return to the court next Friday night to entertain Big Bend, Wash.

"We kinda set the goal of holding them under 60," Coach Fred Frenkle said afterward. "But we got off to a shaky start in the second half and when they hit all those early points I figured that was gone."

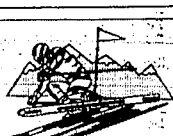
"I didn't feel that we would get to 100 ourselves because I thought they would roll the ball over offensively with a lot of patience and there just wouldn't be that many offensive opportunities for us," he continued.

"Coaches have a way of mixing up combinations to hold down their score a little, too," he admitted. "But this bunch has always shown the ability to explode and get a lot of points in a hurry. That's what happened tonight and that's how we got over 100."

Ernest Byner prepares by not thinking about big playoff fumble

CLEVELAND — Playoffs bring out the best and the worst in Ernest Byner, owner of Cleveland's top two postseason rushing performances as well as the most famous fumble in team history.

"I'm trying not to think about all that," Byner said as he prepared for Saturday's AFC wild-card game against the Houston Oilers. "If I try to think about having that big game, I'll just end up causing problems for myself."

Byner's last playoff memory is a dark one. The Browns were on the verge of tying last season's AFC championship game in Denver when he fumbled the ball away at the Broncos' 3-yard line, stopping Cleveland one game short of the Super Bowl for the second straight year.

Yet, Byner might more fairly be remembered as the man who broke Jim Brown's 21-year-old team record for rushing in a playoff game. Byner ran for 161 yards in a loss to the Miami Dolphins in January 1986, smashing Brown's record of 114 yards set in 1964 against Baltimore.

Byner surpassed Brown's mark again in January of this year, running for 129 yards in a divisional playoff victory over the Indianapolis Colts. And in the loss to Denver the following week, he was superb until the closing seconds, running 15 times for 67 yards and catching seven passes for 120 yards. He scored two touchdowns.

He realizes his past heroics, and his blunder, will be in the spotlight again Saturday.

"You don't want to get too hyped up, but it's hard not to at this time of year," he said.

Though ticket sales for Saturday's

game initially were sluggish, Byner said fans-around Cleveland are regaining the playoff spirit they showed during the past two seasons.

"I went out shopping yesterday and I got stopped about a dozen times by people wishing me well," he said. The Oilers, meanwhile, say they aren't having any trouble at all keeping the game in perspective. The two teams, rivals in the AFC Central Division, played twice already this season, with each team winning at home.

Cleveland will host the rubber match because it had a superior record. Both teams went 10-6 overall during the regular season.

"When you play Cleveland, you really don't even look at it as a playoff game," said quarterback Warren Moon. "You look at it as a divisional opponent. We know each other so well, it's just going to come down to out-executing each other and making the big plays. That's where they won the game last week. They made more big plays than we did in the later stages of the game."

The Browns defeated Houston 28-23 Sunday, overcoming a 16-point deficit with three straight touchdowns in the second half. The Oilers, who could have eliminated Cleveland from the playoffs and clinched home-field advantage for the wild-card game, have been replaying that loss in their minds this week.

"When we went up 23-7, if we could have held them on the next series, we would have been in better position," Moon said. "But they went on a long drive and scored, and I think that's where it started to get away. If we could have gotten the ball back and scored one more time, I think they might have given up."

Neither team ran the ball well, at

least partly because of poor footing on the cold, snowy field. Temperatures in the 40s were expected Saturday, though rain may make the field slippery once again.

"I don't think the conditions were a factor," Byner said. "Our defense did

a good job against them. When we had the ball, Houston was doing a lot of stunting at the line and really clogging things up in the middle."

"We have to be able to get outside some to stop them from clogging the middle."

Independence Bowl offers UTEP, S. Mississippi match

SHREVEPORT, La. — The Southern Mississippi and Texas-El Paso defenses ran through a dizzying variety of fronts one last time Thursday, all designed to stop what promises to be a high-scoring Independence Bowl.

"We won't do anything we haven't done before," UTEP defensive coordinator Mike Church said. "We're just going to do a lot more of it."

UTEP, 10-2, meets Southern Mississippi, 9-2, Friday night in the 13th annual Independence Bowl.

The game pits two offenses which scored often this year and two defenses which gave yards freely. UTEP scored 49 of 50 times inside the 25-yard line and has averaged 35.5 points per game. Quarterback Pat Hegarty threw for 2,529 yards and 17 touchdowns and leads an offense that has averaged 413.3 yards per game.

"The key is we have to vary our approach," Southern Mississippi defensive coordinator Ellis Johnson said. "I don't think we're good enough to do just one thing. We've got to do a lot of different things and

not let them know when we're going to do them."

The UTEP defense, meanwhile, allowed an average of 420.5 yards per game, but kept opponents to an average of 19.8 points per game.

Southern Mississippi quarterback Brett Favre leads a Golden Eagles offense that averaged 187.3 yards rushing and 269 yards passing per game. Favre threw for 2,271 yards and 16 touchdowns.

The Golden Eagles defense was victimized the most through the air, allowing an average of 166 yards rushing, but 243.3 yards per game passing.

"Our defensive guys have always risen to the occasion when faced with a good offense and we hope this is one of those occasions," Southern Mississippi coach Curley Hallman said. "I don't know how many points it's going to take to win. I hope our kicking game is good and our defense turns the ball over to us several times."

UTEP's offense will be hampered by the loss of leading rusher John Harvey, one of two Miners who did not make the trip from El Paso. Harvey, UTEP's all-time leading rusher,

rushed for 751 yards and 10 touchdowns this year, despite nagging ankle and knee injuries.

UTEP sports information director Eddie Mullens said Harvey didn't make the trip because of an ankle injury. An El Paso television station, however, reported this week that Harvey failed an NCAA drug test. UTEP athletic director Brad Hovius has refused comment on the report.

UTEP players also have had to deal this week with the uncertainty surrounding the UTEP coaching situation. Miners coach Bob Stull as accepted to head coaching position at Missouri and Hovius had hoped to name a replacement before the game.

Hovius said Wednesday that the top three contenders to replace Stull removed themselves from consideration this week and a replacement wouldn't be named until after Christmas.

"Hopefully, the players are just interested in playing and aren't worrying about the coaching change," Stull said. "We have a lot of seniors on the team and I think they're excited about playing."

Rathbun's craft requires multiple skills

TWIN FALLS — The small, white bungalow on 8th Avenue in Twin Falls looks ordinary enough. The only clues on the outside to its owner's less-than-provincial existence are American, British and Canadian flags flown in descending order, and a Swiss flag prominently displayed on the porch.

Inside, however, is the workshop of a skinny Swiss Santa Claus. His meticulously crafted music boxes, historically accurate metal miniatures, whirling carousels and customized chess sets will delight families all over the country on Christmas morning.

Rex Rathbun, a blue-eyed, spectacled, 71-year-old craftsman, works out of a small, pleasantly cluttered workshop and a chilly but service-

able basement to produce his one-of-a-kind collectibles.

"It keeps me busy and, off the streets at night," he says, smiling. Born in Berne, Switzerland, his speech, though usually unaccented, is interspersed with French words. His gestures are expansive and he calls his wife, Evelyn, "My Love."

Rathbun traces his lineage in Switzerland back to the 12th century and says his family has been making clocks for about 500 years and music boxes for 300 years. "The world says so, I don't, that the clock movements that my family makes are the finest in the world," he says modestly.

Rathbun does custom work for people interested in procuring unique, handmade items. His metal miniatures, which he casts from wax figures he's molded himself, include armies of knights, crusaders,

samurai warriors, Napoleonic figures, Indians, Turkish warriors and Confederate and Union soldiers. His sets of Scottish Highlanders sport tartans painted on their kilts representing real clans.

"I use a good metal because I want my things to be collector's items," says Rathbun, who uses a mixture of 10 percent silver, 20 percent tin and other metals to cast his figures.

Rathbun says it takes the skills of a musician, mathematician, jeweler, cabinetmaker and metalsmith to create a fine music box. "This is why you don't see much this caliber of music box anymore," says Rathbun, who as a young boy learned the art from his uncle and other associates. "Making music boxes is a dying art because there are so many skills involved. Little ones of today want instant gratification."

Prices for Rathbun's music boxes range from \$15 for a simple, 12-key music box, to \$4,000 for an elaborate production. He is currently working on a \$4,000 music box for a lawyer in Wyoming. He doesn't advertise. All his customers have seen his work or heard of it by word of mouth.

Rich Nine, a local resident, asked Rathbun to make a music box out of cherrywood for his wife a couple of Christmases ago. "I was impressed when I first realized he made music boxes," says Nine. "Especially when I found out that he used to actually make the movement as well as the box itself. It's very impressive when you see them because of how intricate the movement is and how pretty the music is when it plays."

Rathbun is still able to take any tune and put it to music as long as he considers it music of good taste.

Quality is important he says — he was raised to live life to the fullest and always do his best. When Rathbun is talking music he's talking classical composers: Tchaikovsky, Mozart, Beethoven, Schubert. "The caliber of music is par excellence," he says. A music box he presented to his mother when he was 15 years old plays three Tchaikovsky tunes and has more than 2,000 pins on the drum.

To make a music box from movement to box, Rathbun first listens to a composer, then writes the notes out on paper. "First I must understand what the master wanted you to hear," he says.

After he's listened, he recomposes the music so the melody is recognizable in 30 to 35 seconds, the length of time it takes the drum to make

one complete revolution. For each note Rathbun writes he also makes an algebraic equation. The equation tells him where to drill a tiny hole for that note on the drum. He then taps the hole with threads. Into that hole is screwed a steel pin, the size of a hair, which is also tapped with threads. The result is a wheel that looks like a porcupine. Rathbun clips the pins and "tweaks" them according to whether they're going to be loud or softer notes.

Next he takes a steel bar and cuts teeth into it so it looks like a comb. He turns it by filing each tooth to a point. He and listen. File and listen. File and listen until you get the exact harmonics," Rathbun says. That's why it's called "pure music."

The boxes are made out of hard wood and inlaid with exotic woods in patterns or floral designs. Rathbun says he must know the resonance of the woods he uses. "If I've done my job correctly, the music box is just as resonant closed as open because I've used my wood as a sounding board."

Rathbun enjoys producing the exact item a customer is looking for. "There's really not enough customizing for people," he says. "It's been gratifying in my shuffling through the business world to make what people want."

Rathbun, however, had done more than just "sashay" through the business world. His life, he says, has been as meticulously crafted by the God he believes in, like one of his fine music boxes.

Rathbun, whose parents separated when he was young, lived with an uncle and aunt in Switzerland until he completed high school at the age of 14. He spoke seven languages fluently and played the clarinet, saxophone, organ and piano. At 15, his father enrolled him at Stanford University, provided a roof over his head, then left him to support himself and pay for his own education. Lonely, he worked hard to earn enough money to bring his girlfriend, Antoinette, over from Switzerland. He succeeded and they were married when she was 16 and he was 17 years old. That same year Rathbun's wife presented him with a set of healthy twins. The next year another set of twins came along. The next year saw still another set. The following year the Rathbuns capped off their family with the birth of a single son. By the time Rathbun was 21 years old he had 7 children under the age of 5. "I was just a big, dumb, Swiss kid," he says, joking.

Rathbun graduated from Stanford with a math degree, then enrolled at the University of Washington for graduate work. World War II broke out and a beloved aunt of Rathbun's, who was a medical missionary in China, was killed by the Japanese. "I got pretty hot under the collar," says Rathbun who decided to join the service and fight.

After the war Rathbun developed a

chain of war surplus stores between Seattle and North Dakota.

When the Korean War came along, Rathbun saw that surplus was drying up, so he got involved with timber in California. He bought five million board feet of redwood timber, logged it, cut it and dried it. In 1952, the whole thing burned to the ground.

"I lost millions," he says. Rathbun took his family and went to Chicago to work with his brother-in-law who was employed by a janitorial firm. He started his own business and in eight years, the timber baron turned window washer had 100 full-time employees.

In 1964, Rathbun's wife, Antoinette died. The same year he lost a daughter and a granddaughter. In 1970, Rathbun married his present wife, Evelyn. Together they eventually opened three stores in California called "La Musique Suisse." "I had clocks and music boxes and delightful things," he says. He made clocks to play whatever tunes the customers wanted, then he would sometimes deliver the clocks himself to the customer's home and tune the clock to their wall. "If a clock was set on a wall, the whole wall would become resonant with the clock," says Rathbun.

He sold the stores in 1975, went to Canada to retire, then bought a franchise of solar energy stores in Idaho

and opened several outlets. By 1980 he had lost \$960,000 on the solar outlets. Shortly afterward he was in a plane wreck and hurt both his arms. In 1982 Rathbun took a job with a janitorial firm in Boise and eventually wound up in Twin Falls. "Time and tide take you to all corners of the world," he says.

After working hard for the janitorial firm, Rathbun says his body just began to wear out. Paralysis began to set in, but he has since fully recovered.

"We've seen him sick, very sick," says Virginia Johnson, a friend of the Rathbuns. "But he's always on top. He never complains."

Rathbun and his wife now live modestly on a social security income, making music boxes and miniatures, and working with Open Doors, an organization which secretly sends bibles into communist countries. He is just now beginning to collect again all the tools he needs for making his boxes and miniatures.

Sitting in his office amid magazine clippings, ribbons from state fairs, groups of miniatures, two small

hand-carved wooden busts of Beethoven and Schubert, crests of Swiss cantons, and a wall of books, Rathbun says there is just one thing he would like people to know.

"If I were to say anything to anybody it would be don't give up, he says. 'Just don't give up.'

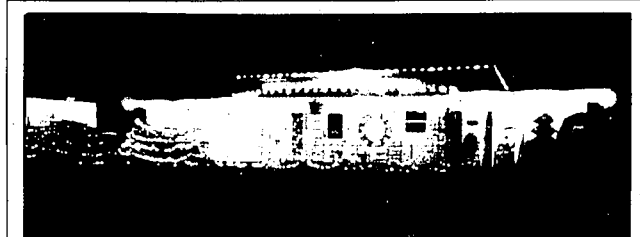

American Music Awards

George Michael, Def Leppard top nominees

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP) — Pop dynamo George Michael and heavy metal leaders Def Leppard were the top nominees Wednesday in the 16th annual American Music Awards, which chooses winners by popular vote.

Michael, whose crossover album, "Faith," has spawned six hit singles over the last year and scored on both pop and soul charts, was nominated as favorite male vocalist in the pop-rock and soul-rhythm and blues categories and received favorite album nominations in those same categories.

Def Leppard was nominated in the pop-rock category for favorite duo or group and favorite album for their "Hysteria." LP They also received the favorite artist and favorite album nominations in the heavy metal category.

Earning three nominations each for the awards were heavy metal bands Guns N' Roses and Van Halen. Country music star Randy Travis also earned three nominations.

The awards show, set for broadcast Jan. 30 on ABC-TV, added heavy metal and rap music to categories for this year while eliminating video music awards.

"We did it several years ago with the disco era. We just added the category. It seemed logical," producer Dick Clark said.

Clark, who this year took over production of the annual MTV Video Awards show, said videos had been eliminated because "There are other awards shows that seem to take care of that category."

The American Music Awards nomi-

ination categories this year include pop-rock, soul-rhythm and blues, country, heavy metal and rap.

Among the groups and performers receiving at least two nominations were Alabama, Rick Astley, Tracy Chapman, D.J. Jazzy Jeff & The Fresh Prince, Whitney Houston, Michael Jackson, Gladys Knight & The Pips, Run D.M.C., Salt-N-Pepa, George Strait, Al B. Sure! and Steve Winwood.

Nominees were announced by Jermaine Jackson and Rita Coolidge during a morning news conference. Clark said this year's show will include tributes to Ray Orbison, soul singer Brook Benton and pop singer Andy Gibb. All three died in the last year. The show will also present an award of merit to an artist yet to be announced for outstanding contributions to musical entertainment.

Hosts for this year's show will be Kenny Rogers, Anita Baker, Rod

Stewart and Debbie Gibson. They also will perform, along with Rick Astley, Fleetwood Mac, Gloria Estefan and the Miami Sound Machine, Guns N' Roses, K.T. Oslin, Randy Travis, and D.J. Jazzy Jeff & The Fresh Prince.

Clark noted the American Music Awards show is traditionally the second-highest rated awards show on television, next to the Oscars.

Names of nominees are compiled from year-end sales charts of the music industry trade publication Cash Box.

Winners are selected by a public polling of 20,000 people who receive ballots sent by Herbert Altman Communications Research Inc. The ballots are counted by the Peat, Marwick, Mitchell and Co. accounting firm.

The Grammy Awards of the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences are determined by votes

of artists and technicians in the music industry. Nominees for those awards will be made Jan. 12.

Refunds available soon for 2 Elvis concerts

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Elvis Presley fans still holding tickets for two 1977 concerts canceled because of his death can get refunds soon, the state director of unclaimed property said.

Presley, who died on Aug. 16, 1977, at his home in Memphis, was scheduled for hometown performances on Aug. 27 and 28.

Many of the fans who bought tickets for those shows, for \$12.50 to \$15 each, have never gotten their money back and it has been held in a savings account, said Darrell May, director of the Mid-

South Coliseum. The unclaimed ticket money, which originally totaled \$150,000, has grown with interest to some \$411,000, May said.

In 1982, the Presley estate and the promoters of the concerts filed suit to get the money, but a state Court of Appeals ruled last week that ticket holders have first crack at it.

Susan Clayton, director of the state's division of unclaimed property, said ticket holders will probably be allowed to keep them once presenting them to claim refunds.

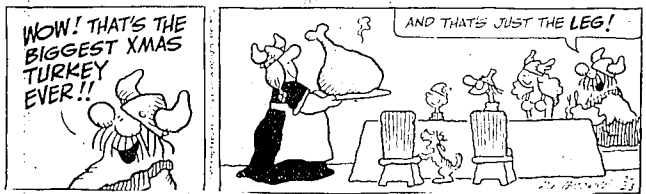

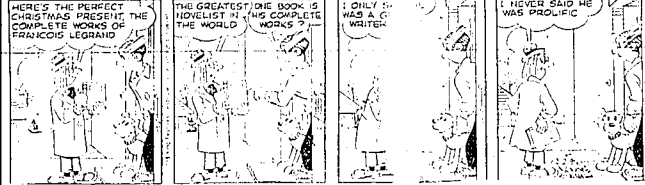

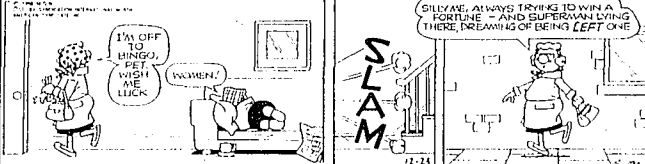

Holiday movies include comedy, potential Oscar nominees

Ho-ho-ho indeed. This year the movie industry has taken 'Tis the season to be jolly' seriously, and 10 of a surprisingly sparse 16 holiday films are comedies.

'Hollers II' is the single reminder of the violence of Christmas past ('Scarface', '48 Hrs.', 'Beverly Hills Cop'). The industry will, of course, be laughing all the way, as the period between Thanksgiving and New Year's is exceeded only by summer in making holly spirit's bright.

As usual, moviedom is releasing a flurry of heavyweight Oscar hopefuls before the Dec. 31 deadline.

'Mississippi Burning,' with Gene Hackman and Willem Dafoe as G-men investigating the 1964 murder of three civil-rights workers, opened last weekend in some cities and is a sure award contender.

Other promising entrants include 'Rain Man,' with Tom Cruise as a hustler and Dustin Hoffman as his autistic brother; 'Talk Radio,' Oliver Stone's version of star Eric Bogosian's play about an abrasive radio show host; and 'Torch Song Trilogy,' with Harvey Fierstein, Anne Bancroft and Matthew Broderick in Fierstein's play about the tribulations of a drag queen.

'Working Girl,' a comedy-drama about corporate love, might just be this year's answer to 'Broadcast News.' Melanie Griffith, Sigourney Weaver and Harrison Ford star and Mike Nichols directs this throwback to the cocktail comedies of the '30s.

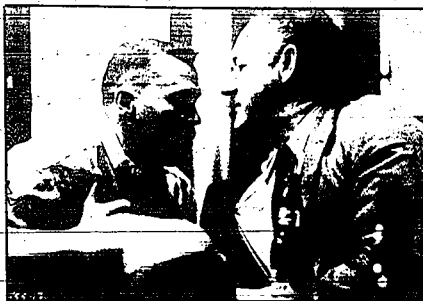
And speaking of mixed beverages, writer-director Robert Towne's sexy 'Tequila Sunrise' is a romantic alternative. It features Mel Gibson as a reluctant drug dealer, Kurt Russell as his best friend, a slick narcotics detective, and Michelle Pfeiffer as the restaurateur who loves them both. Hot times are had in a hot tub.

Already come (and in some cases gone) are 'Scrooged,' the Bill Murray remake of Dickens' 'A Christmas Carol,' 'Cocoon: The Return,' the disappointing senior sci-fi sequel, and 'Far North,' Sam Shepard's maudlin Minnesota salute to fady love Jessica Lange or still on the way are the following.

'Mississippi Burning.' Two FBI agents — by-the-booker Willem Dafoe and maverick Gene Hackman — investigate the disappearance of three civil rights workers in '64. The disturbing dramatic thriller is directed by Alan Parker (of 'Angel Heart') from a Chris Gerolamo screenplay.

Hackman's performance is brilliant, the subject powerful, but the filmmakers tend to preach somewhat.

'My Stepmother Is an Alien.' Dan Aykroyd is a widowed scientist who has a close encounter with Kim Basinger as a bombshell from out of this world. His marriage to the extraterrestrial beauty is resented by his 13-year-old daughter (Alyson Hannigan). Richard Benjamin directs this comic fantasy.

—'The Naked Gun.' The "Airplane" trumvirate — David and Jerry Zucker and Jim Abrahams — revive their quickly canceled TV show, 'Police Squad,' with this uproarious low comedy. Leslie Nielsen is back as the oblivious Lt. Frank Drebin, backed by Ricardo Montalban, George Kennedy, Priscilla Presley and O.J. Simpson.

—'Scrooged.' Bill Murray is the modern-day embodiment of Scrooge as a TV network president in this remake of 'A Christmas Carol.' Richard Donner, whose career has ranged from 'The Goonies' to 'Lethal Weapon,' directed.

—'Tequila Sunrise.' Robert Towne, screenwriter of 'Chinatown' and 'Shampoo,' wrote and directed this glossy, if muddled thriller about childhood pals Mel Gibson and Kurt Russell, who wind up on opposite sides of the badge. Gibson is a kindly drug dealer and Russell is the cop assigned to bring him to justice. Michelle Pfeiffer, the woman in the middle, runs a nouvelle California pastaria.

—'Twins.' Directed by Ivan Reitman of 'Ghostbusters,' this mixed-up, mean-spirited screwball comedy reunites a couple of genetically engineered siblings — Arnold Schwarzenegger and Danny DeVito

as twins long separated from their six fathers and one mother. What a woman! (And the Arn Man loses his on-screen virginity.) Chloë Webb and Kelly Preston co-star.

—'Dirty Rotten Scoundrels.' Michael Caine and Steve Martin co-star in this remake of the consummate 1964 comedy, 'Bedtime Story.' They're Riviera con men who risk their careers on a bet: Who can be the first to seduce Illinois soap heiress Glenna Headly? Frank Oz, father of Miss Piggy, directs this romantic romp.

—'Tim Gonna Get You Sucker.' Writer-director-star Keenen Ivory Wayans parodies with sporadic success the black exploitation genre of the early '70s with the help of some of its veterans: Jim Brown, Bernie Casey and Isaac Hayes.

—'Rain Man.' Aspiring hustler Tom Cruise faces his greatest challenge when he tries to talk his autistic brother (Dustin Hoffman) out of a \$3 million inheritance. Barry Levinson of 'Good Morning, Vietnam' and 'Tin Men' directs this tale of brotherly love.

—'Talk Radio.' Eric Bogosian plays a Dallas late-night radio host who becomes the target of right-wing listeners in this adaptation of Bo-

gosian's off-broadway play directed by 'Platoon's' Oliver Stone. The supporting cast includes Alec Baldwin, Ellen Greene and John Pankow.

—'Working Girl.' Scitellbut has it that Melanie Griffith gives her breakthrough performance as a feisty secretary determined to fight her way to the top of a Wall Street brokerage firm. Harrison Ford is sympathetic to her cause, while her idea-stealing boss, Sigourney Weaver, is not. Mike Nichols directs this romantic comedy-drama from a script by Kevin Wade of 'Key Exchange.'

—'Hellbound.' 'Hollers II' is designed to take the scare out of those credit-card bills. Clive Barker offers a sequel to his tale of interdimensional

sexual oddities. Clare Higgins, bludgeoned to death in the original, returns as a bloodthirsty spirit, still in pursuit of teen naïf Ashley Laurence. Tony Randel directs.

—'Torch Song Trilogy.' Paul Bogart directs this adaptation of Harvey Fierstein's hit play about a New York drag queen (Fierstein), the men who done him wrong and his shrewish mother (Anne Bancroft). Matthew Broderick plays his younger lover and Brian Kerwin the bisexual torn between Fierstein and his freeleaved wife. Set in the '70s, 'Trilogy' reflects the fact and loose values before the advent of AIDS. It is nevertheless a timeless, wonderfully acted drama about getting along with each other.

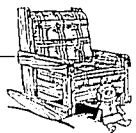

Alvin Ailey to be honored despite continued worries over finances

In recent years, dance has taken enormous strides out of the insular world it once occupied, becoming more accessible and combining diverse influences, from ballet to tap to jazz. In the forefront has been dancer/choreographer Alvin Ailey, whose dance company bears his name and who is being honored in "The Kennedy Center Honors: A Celebration of the Performing Arts" (CBS, Dec. 30). Other honorees include George Burns, Myrna Loy and violinist Alexander Schneider.

During the course of two interviews, Ailey is by turns brusque, charming, eloquent, impatient and moody. His company is celebrating its 30th anniversary this year, but due to lack of money it may close for good next spring; Ailey at first does not want to talk about such matters as his artistic vision ("Not that again," he moans), but rather, the lack of funds for his company.

"You don't understand," he says. "The company's about to close. We desperately need an infusion of public interest, not to mention money. We have an enormous deficit, we can't stay in this building, we have no place to go. We have a board that's not as active as it should be. No one wants to talk about sad things like this during these times." Ailey's woes are not unusual. Despite a growing interest in dance, funds for dance

companies are not always forthcoming.

Once Ailey gets this off his chest, however, he warms slightly and begins to talk about the company and its aims. His company's dance style, culled from jazz, ballet and modern dance, took shape through years of apprenticeship with other companies. He was also influenced by the rituals of the Baptist church, which he attended as a child, and an early interest in gymnastics. The dances he has choreographed — primitive, stirring, athletic and reflective — combine all these influences. And he created his company to remove dance from its privileged setting.

"We've always wanted to get dance out of the elitist focus, to bring it to the people," he says. "That's why we run workshops and lectures, why we go into the schools. The company is integrated, but we've tried to really keep black culture alive through our dances. I'm incredibly proud of what we've done and who has come out of here."

That "who" includes Madonna, Michael Peters (who choreographs for Michael Jackson) and Judith Jamison, who recently started her own company. Ailey's dances have been

performed around the world, and he has produced several television shows on dance, including "Ailey Celebrates Ellington."

"If the company closes ... God, I don't know," he says. "My head is going completely mad. Maybe I'll move to Paris or California. There are always things I can do — it's the other people (in his company) I'm concerned about."

And if the company should continue? "There are a million projects I want to do," he says. "I want to keep showing the humanist element in dance, to continue the school scholarship program, to show many dances in repertory, not just my own ballets, to start a children's theater, to do more community work."

"I just want to have a place," he says, "that is ultimately creative."

On the Cover Alvin Ailey, the innovative choreographer whose dance company bears his own name, is one of the artists who will be honored on "The Kennedy Center Honors: A Celebration of the Performing Arts." It airs Friday, Dec. 30, on CBS.

Lord Ashton brightens the season for viewers of 'General Hospital'

"A charming scoundrel" is probably the best description of "General Hospital's" dapper Lord Ashton, who is brightening the season for viewers.

Hugo Napier, from London and Scotland, last seen playing charmers on "As the World Turns" and "All My Children," turns out to be a full-fledged rogue in "General Hospital."

Ashton looks like the handsome playboy on the outside, but inside there's a shifty mind at work. Con artist supreme, Ashton likes being devious. So far, he's not been nasty or cruel, but clearly Ashton is up to no good with his schemes about ancient scrolls and a lost civilization.

While his sleek wife Arielle has other fish to fry, Ashton talks about raising a team of trustworthy men, like Colton and Sean. The tip-off is "trustworthy men" — scoundrels love using such terms. It makes them feel respectable, if only to themselves.

This winter, Napier's Lord Ashton is in for some interesting developments. He's all charm while busy stirring up trouble. The man would like to go straight, but that would be no fun. He craves the gambler's excitement, raising the ante even if he thinks he's going to lose.

Lord Ashton represents a shot of glamour and mischief for fans. A whiff of sophistication and a relief from some of those handsome, one-dimensional males currently in vogue. Time for a touch of David Niven with a criminal mind.

Raised in London, trained in New York, rejected in Los Angeles for three years, Napier has the seasoning and sass to get away with playing a dapper thief. Hugo could take off in this role or at the very least inspire the writers to come up with some wild plotting while dealing with

"I can't tell you why I flopped in L.A.," Napier mused while lying flat on his back in his dressing room, an ice pack on his swollen eye, the result of a hug.

Hugo had been advised by a backstage authority to exercise his left

arm to ease his eye problems. Crazy as it sounded, it seemed to work. Hugo was set to go on the set shortly, regardless of the condition of his eye.

"I have a juvenile rebellious streak in me," Hugo declared. "I've never gotten rid of it for some reason. I've always felt a little different, a bit apart, from others. Somehow that fits in this business. Besides, I like the people in it. We're considered a little naughty and I like that."

Raising a family and being out of work drove Hugo crazy. His wife, Oona, toiled as a makeup artist until Napier clicked again.

"Oona hated L.A. in those days," Napier said. "She used to go to the gym and hide in the toilet and cry. That's all over now, everyone has ad-

justed."

Christmas will be spent on the Isle of Mull in Scotland with the family, the sheep and a "wee dram."

As for Ashton's black heart — ah, that will be put on hold, at least for the holidays.

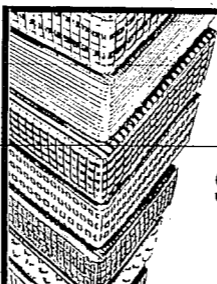

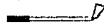

Coca-Cola plans 3-D commercial during the Super Bowl half time

Wondering what to wear to this year's Super Bowl party? In an extravagant effort to literally catch the eye of the nation's largest television audience, Coca-Cola says it plans to hand out 20 million sets of 3-D glasses.

The glasses will let TV viewers see a three-dimensional broadcast of a 13-minute magic show shown during half time and, of course, a 45-second Diet Coke commercial that could cost Coca-Cola as much as \$2 million in all.

The half-time extravaganza and commercial will be aired on Jan. 22, Super Bowl Sunday, and can be seen with or without the glasses. But to see the show in 3-D, viewers will have to pick up glasses that Coke is distributing free of charge at grocery stores nationwide.

"When millions of Americans sit down to watch the biggest game of the year, half-time will feel like an extra quarter of non-stop action," said

Michael A. Beindorff, vice president of advertising at Atlanta-based Coca-Cola.

A lot more than fun and games, however, is behind Coke's unusual effort.

The bitter struggle with arch rival Pepsi — especially for the growing diet soft drink market — is forcing both advertisers to vastly change their advertising strategies. "This year's Super Bowl action won't be confined to the stadium," said Michael K. Lorelli, Pepsi's executive vice president of sales and marketing. "It's also going to be a good, old-fashioned clash of the cola titans."

Traditionally, the two soft drink makers have waited until the Grammy Awards in late February kick off their annual ad campaigns. The Grammy Awards, after all, generally attract the large numbers of the young viewers that both soft drink makers want to attract.

This year, however, with increased attention focused on the fast-growing, \$10 billion U.S. diet soft drink market, the Super Bowl may prove to be a

far more attractive alternative. For one, it has by far the largest audience of the two events — with an estimated 54 million households tuning in.

But perhaps even more important is the timing of the Super Bowl. It comes just a few weeks after the Christmas holidays when many viewers are either on post-holiday diets or at least considering the possibility of shedding some weight.

"More and more men out there are drinking diet soft drinks," said Gary Hemphill, editor of the Cleveland-based trade magazine *Beverage Industry*. "And football — especially the Super Bowl — is the logical tie-in."

Neither Pepsi nor Coke officials will discuss their story lines of the ads they plan to air. Diet Coke officials did, however, indicate that their ad may have some sort of tie-in to either the Super Bowl game or the game's half-time magic show.

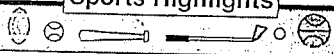
"Obviously the object is to take people by surprise," said Spencer Plavoukos, chairman of the New York office of Lintas: Worldwide, the ad agency for Diet Coke.

'Tattingers' gets 2nd life

NEW YORK — The creators of "Tattingers" did not just expect to be canceled. They already had planned the plot of their final episode.

Nick Tattinger comes into his restaurant and finds it jammed. As he goes around and says hello to everyone, he sees Dick Van Dyke, Mary Tyler Moore, James Naughton and all the other stars, producers and writers of this season's canceled or put-on-hiatus new shows.

"Then the end of the night comes and nobody can pay the check because they're all out of a job, and the restaurant goes out of business," says co-creator and co-executive producer Bruce Paltrow.

That is just the sort of black com-

edy that Paltrow and his team used to write for "St. Elsewhere" and could not seem to duplicate on the new series. But they have another crack at it now that NBC has taken the extraordinary step — at Paltrow's suggestion — of renewing "Tattinger's" as a half-hour sitcom rather than as an hour-long drama.

"The only reason they went for the idea was that Brandon (Tartikoff, the president of NBC Entertainment) had it as well," says Paltrow, who made the proposal Dec. 12 and got a go-ahead last Thursday night. "It was the same creative thinking that caused him to renew 'St. Elsewhere' for Year 2 (despite dreadfully low ratings). And I promise that the new 'Tattingers' is going to be the funniest show we can do."

'Donahue,' 'Oprah' shows sell tickets early

Q: How do they select the audiences for such daytime talk shows as "Donahue" and "Oprah Winfrey"?

A: Every show has its own approach to audience selection. The 200 tickets for each "Donahue," which is taped at NBC studios in New York City's Rockefeller Center, are obtained only by mail and are on a first-come, first-served basis, which results in waiting lists of up to five months or longer. Occasionally, a specific type of audience is gathered for a particular theme (an audience of homeless individuals might discuss their plight, for example).

Oprah Winfrey's show limits advance reservations to no longer than one week. The audience of about 120 at the WSL-TV studios in Chicago is geared to reflect the theme of the day as often as possible ("for a program on single mothers, we would like to have a lot of single mothers in the audience," said a spokesman). This is accomplished with a special 30-second promo at the end of the program in which Winfrey points out future topics (with a telephone number that can be seen

only by Chicago viewers) and asks interested parties to call.

Q: A few weeks ago Dick Clark had a weekly variety series on CBS. What happened to it?

A: "Dick Clark Presents," a series which was booked for a six-week run, is history. CBS added the series at a time when it was faced with the possibility of the writers' strike stretching well into the fall season.

Q: Is the actress who plays Lily on "The New Munsters" the same actress who was Betty on "Barnaby Jones"?

A: Yes, behind the makeup is veteran actress Lee Meriwether, whose resume not only includes "Barnaby" (1973-80), but also the daytime soaps "Clear Horizon" and "The Young Marrieds," and prime time's "The Time Tunnel" (1966-67), "The New Andy Griffith Show" (1971) and the quiz show "Masquerade Party" (1974-75). The former Miss America (1955) has made lots of guest appearances on programs over the years, even appearing as one of the actresses who played Catwoman on "Batman." Yvonne DeCarlo was Lily on the original "Munsters."

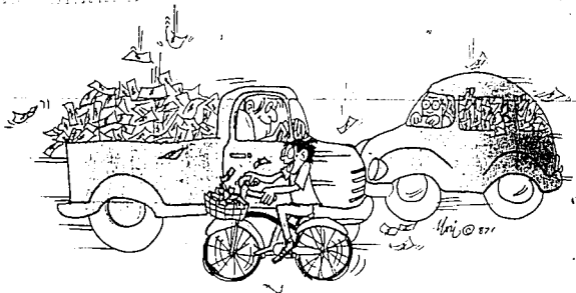
'Buck James' only sees 1 season

Q: What happened to the Dennis Weaver series, "Buck James"? I only saw it two or three times.

A: The series survived only one season on ABC before being canceled. It was subject to many preemptions, had its time slot moved from Sundays to Thursdays, and even went off the air for awhile. Nothing helped. Nonetheless, 22 episodes (a full season) eventually were broadcast.

Q: I've noticed in watching the reruns that the character Tony Roselli (Jack Scalia) appeared in the final half-dozen or so episodes of "Remington Steele." What was the purpose of introducing the character so late?

A: The producers thought it would be fun and "juice up the romantic angle" of the series to add another romantic leading man who could compete for Laura's affection. And, rather than create an opposite of the Steele character, they decided to also make the new man a dashing, adventure-some, suave personality, but with enough differences to keep viewers' attention. Unfortunately, NBC's "Remington Steele" was canceled before that particular aspect of the series could be expanded.
