Senators vote no; pay hike rolls ahead

WASHINGTON — The Senate on Thursday night voted to reject a proposed 51 percent congressional pay raise, but Speaker Jim Wright said the House would let it take effect next week and then vote to reduce it to a decent raise of 30 percent.

to legislation to ban members from pocketing speaking fees or other honoraria should the pay raise take effect.

The vote against the pay increase was largely symbolic, since both chambers must vote to block it. House procedures make it easier to protect a pay raise in that chamber, and Wright, D-Texas, continued as the main target of opponents as he maneuvered to protect most of the raise.

House members' public positions, like those of the Senate, have been overwhelmingly against the 51 percent pay increase, which must be disapproved by both chambers before Feb. 8 or it will automatically take effect.

Wright released partial results of a personal questionnaire, showing 57 percent of House members opposing a pay raise vote before the deadline and 54 percent favoring it. The 51 percent pay raise he was proposing was a decent raise but not an exorbitant raise, Wright said.

Demo memo on INEL polarizes GOP legislative leaders

The memo found its way into the hands of Republican legislative leaders this week.

Tritium supply squeeze seems likely

WASHINGTON — The Energy Department's chief safety official cast new doubt Thursday on whether a South Carolina reactor complex can be restarted in time to avoid a squeeze on supplies of a material vital to producing nuclear weapons.

Richard Starostski told a Senate Armed Services subcommittee it was "not likely" that even one of the three reactors at the Savannah River Plant near Aiken, S.C., would be able to operate by the department's official target date of late 1989.

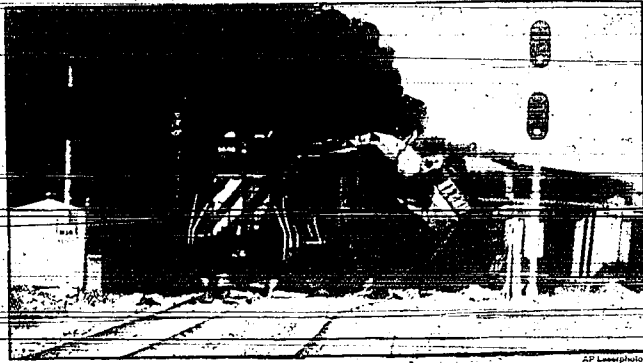
"A lot of things would have to happen very quickly, and they are not happening," Starostski said in response to questioning by Sen. Albert Gore Jr., D-Tenn.

The three Savannah River reactors have been closed down since last summer because of structural and management flaws. The plant is the country's only source of tritium, a perishable gas needed in the manufacture of most U.S. nuclear weapons.

The Energy Department late last summer had indicated it might be able to restart the K reactor at Savannah River by last December, but that date slipped as officials saw increasingly complex problems in improving safety at the plant.

"It is our goal to resume operations this calendar year," Wade said, adding later that at best, a restart could be accomplished by October and that if new safety or technical problems were found, the target date could slip.

Wade said in a written statement to the subcommittee that the effort to resume production of tritium is becoming critical because of the weapons requirements.

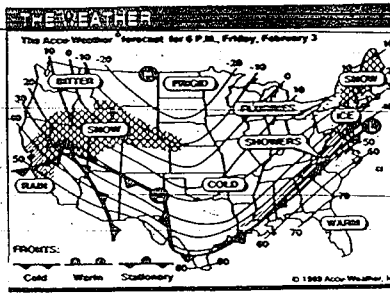


Smoke billows from railroad car filled with polyethylene after Helena, Mont., explosion

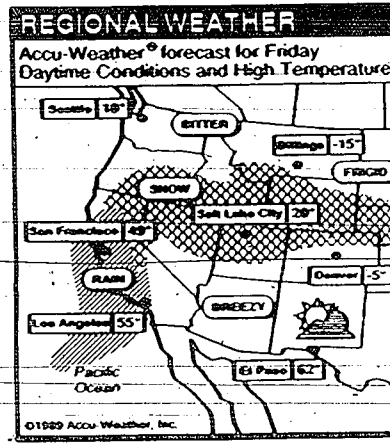

In Washington, the Federal Railroad Administration said the chain of events began when a cab heater malfunctioned in a locomotive hauling 45 freight cars over the Continental Divide west of Helena.

The crew stopped the freight to exchange the lead locomotive for another lead locomotive with a better heater, the FRA said in a statement.

But the fire proved stubborn, and the blaze was still burning late Thursday afternoon despite firefighting efforts.

Authorities later discovered that the hopper car, though it carried a sign indicating PVC was aboard, actually contained granular polyethylene, and that the smoke bilion dioxide and carbon monoxide.

"It dissipates in the atmosphere and is not serious," said Paul Spengler, the county disaster coordinator.

The explosions occurred in an open area on the city's west side and severed one of three major power lines, authorities said.

Health, welfare increases may only be start of budget spiral

BOISE (AP) — Legislative budget writers were warned Thursday that the 12.5 percent increase Gov. Cecil Andrus is seeking in health and welfare spending is just the beginning of a budget spiral that will grip the state well into the 1990s.

"You can expect to see large increases next year and the year after," budget analyst Dick Burns told the Joint Finance Appropriations Committee. "I suspect in the decade of the '90s you will see increases in this program, and other social programs."

In a 2½-hour presentation to the panel, Health and Welfare Director Richard Donovan detailed the increases in general tax spending proposed by Andrus, pointing out that in many instances the decisions were effectively out of the governor's hands.

"This is driven by federal mandates and the need to prevent more expensive problems down the road," Donovan said. "We're asking for some sizeable appropriations" to tackle some enormous responsibilities.

Andrus proposed general tax spending by the department of \$99.1 million for the year that begins July 1, with another \$240 million coming from the federal government and other sources. The bulk of the general tax increase is for welfare programs and the governor's assault on child abuse, but he also outlined expansion of the environmental quality staff in the first phase of increased state oversight of the Idaho National

Legislative Action Complete

HJM1 (Transportation and Defense) — Asks Congress to reject any plans to increase the federal gas tax to balance the federal budget.

Introduced In House

Justice Shepard still in hospital

BOISE (AP) — Allan Shepard, chief justice of the Idaho Supreme Court, remained hospitalized Thursday after suffering chest pains.

Rita Ryan, a spokeswoman at St. Luke's Regional Medical Center, said doctors ruled out a heart attack after conducting tests, and the 66-year-old Shepard was resting comfortably.

He had been moved from the coronary care unit, but Ms. Ryan said it was uncertain when he would be released from the hospital.

INEL burns 'mixed waste'

IDAHO FALLS — A waste incinerator at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory has begun burning "mixed waste," a combination of low-level radioactive and hazardous wastes.

The Waste Experimental Reduction Facility processed 420 pounds of mixed waste on Tuesday, Dan Sanow, WERF program manager, said Thursday.

Opening of a similar facility at the Rocky Flats plant in Colorado has been slowed by environmental concerns.

"Processing this mixture in the WERF incinerator marks another department of Energy step in finding safe and environmentally sound methods of waste disposal," the DOE's Idaho operations office said in a press release.

The WERF facility has been incinerating low-level radioactive waste for more than three years. Sanow said the same unit is used to handle the mixed waste.

"We just kind of entered a new phase," he said.

Most of the 420 pounds of waste burned on Tuesday was contaminated plywood. Sanow said the unit has not handled any waste since Tuesday.

Some mixed waste — such as min-

erals or soils — are impossible to incinerate in the WERF unit. The incinerator can be used to handle contaminated materials such as paper products and protective clothing.

"There will be more mixed waste in the future that the INEL does generate," said Brenda Mikkola, chief of DOE-Idaho's waste management branch.

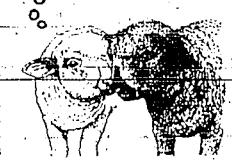
After the mixed wastes are incinerated, the ash is stored in cement and disposed of at the site's low-level waste disposal area at the Radioactive Waste Management Complex. Solidifying the ash in cement neutralizes the hazardous characteristics of the waste, the DOE says. Storing the incinerated ash in cement is approved by the Environmental Protection Agency.

The DOE has said the incineration process can reduce metallic waste to 1 percent of its original volume.

A similar incinerator at the Rocky Flats Plant in Colorado has generated a storm of controversy. Opponents of that plant claim air emissions from the facility could be a health threat to surrounding communities.

The INEL facility includes two filter systems to treat emissions. Sanow said. One unit cleans particulates from the incinerated air and a second removes radioactive particles.

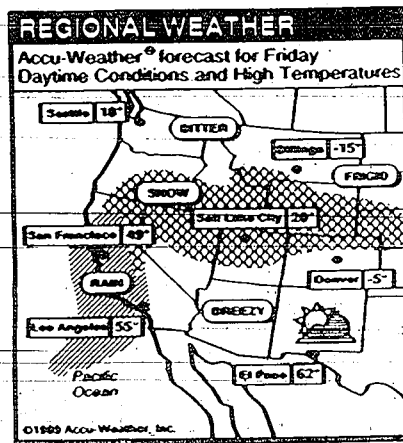
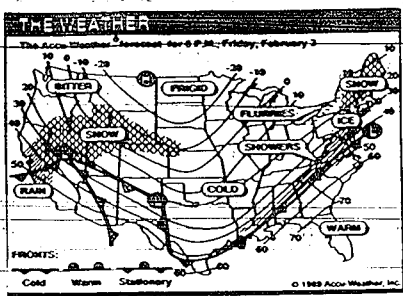

polyvinyl chloride was on fire, PVC produces dangerous hydrogen chloride gas when ignited, and the belief prompted the evacuations and orders to stay indoors.

But authorities later discovered that the hopper car, though it carried a sign indicating PVC was aboard, actually contained granular polyethylene, and that the smoke billowing over the valley was carbon dioxide and carbon monoxide.

"It dissipates in the atmosphere and is not serious," said Paul Spengler, the county disaster coordinator.

But the fire proved stubborn, and the blaze was still burning late Thursday afternoon despite firefighting efforts.

Fire officials feared the blaze could ignite a nearby tank car that contained hydrogen peroxide, the chemical that exploded, but they believed that a layer of ice that encased the car would lessen the threat, Spengler said.

The explosions occurred in an open area on the city's west side and ignited three major power lines, authorities said. Although power initially was knocked out for 37,000 people in and around Helena, electricity was restored to most areas by 11 a.m.

In Washington, the Federal Railroad Administration said the chain of events began when a cab hester malfunctioned in a locomotive hauling 48 freight cars over the Continental Divide west of Helena.

The crew stopped the freight to exchange the lead locomotive for another lead locomotive with a better hester. The FRA said in a statement. This maneuver required them to disconnect the locomotives from the 48 freight cars being hauled.

"When the exchange of locomotives was complete, the crew returned to pick up the freight cars one by one," the FRA said in a statement, adding that the cars had rolled 12 miles east to Helena.

The FRA said the runaway cars hit another locomotive and 21 of the cars derailed. One of those cars hit a propane tank alongside the track, the agency said, touching off an explosion.

The ensuing fire triggered a second explosion in one of the hazardous material cars, the FRA said. "I jumped out of the way when being squashed," said Mike McNellis, who was aboard the locomotive that was struck.

One paramedic was taken to a hospital after inhaling fumes. Firefighters wore respirators as they pured

water on the flames. Authorities evacuated 4,000 to 7,000 people from an area one square mile around the burning railroad cars, said Col. Gary Blair, the adjutant general for Montana's National Guard. City Manager Bill Verwolf put the figure at about 2,000.

Evacuees fled to churches, the Helena Civic Center, the National Guard Army and schools, which were already closed by the severe cold. Temperatures hovered near 30 degrees below zero, which combined with winds to produce wind chills of 70 degrees below zero, the National Weather Service said. Snow fell intermittently.

The collision occurred in an open area between the city dump and golf course, about a quarter-mile north of Carroll College.

"If it wasn't for that golf course and the (adjacent) baseball diamonds, we'd have a lot of tragedies," said Lewis and Clark County Sheriff Chuck O'Reilly. "That really saved our bacon."

Nearly all windows were shattered at Carroll College buildings, the school's physical-education center had portions of its roof blown out, and pieces of railroad car derailed a snow-covered field near a dormitory a quarter-mile away. A 1,500-pound coupler fell into a dormitory.

grappled not only with the bitter cold but with a train derailment and explosion that forced the evacuation of

thousands of people and disrupted electrical power.

Montana's two largest universities shut down through the weekend.

"It's not the cold because we've been open in much colder weather," said Bill Tietz, president of Montana State University at Bozeman. "It's the wind chill we're concerned about."

Classes were canceled at many South Dakota schools because of the wind chill and blowing snow. Schools also were closed in North Dakota, Oregon and elsewhere.

Temperatures overnight dipped to 34 below in three Montana towns: Great Falls, Lewistown, and Cut Bank; and their wind-chill readings were as low as 58 below. In Billings, the record low for a Feb. 2 used to be 13 degrees below zero; on Thursday, it went to 28 below; and 43 below wasn't even expected to be the high for the day.

Record lows for the date also were posted in Astoria, Ore., with 18 above; Casper, Wyo., 27 below; and Sheridan, Wyo., 28 below.

But temperature records at the other end of the scale, though not so widespread as on Wednesday, also were racked up Thursday. Places with record highs or ties for the date included Asheville, N.C., 76 degrees; Cape Hatteras, N.C., 74; Charlotte, N.C., 79; Chattanooga, Tenn., 77; Norfolk, Va.; Richmond, Va., 77; and Wilmington, N.C., 80.

In Alaska, temperatures remained in the cellar near the Canadian border but warmed up elsewhere. Early Thursday it was 37 degrees at Adak in the Aleutian Islands, and 59 degrees below zero at Northway.

At least four traffic fatalities were blamed on the weather, and in Edmonds, Wash., a 35-year-old utility worker died Thursday when he fell while trying to repair a downed power line.

In Martin, S.D., a 69-year-old man was found dead Thursday morning in a vacant lot. Bennett County Chief Deputy Sheriff Craig Dillon said the man's death apparently was caused by exposure.

But a life was saved in North Dakota, when searchers Thursday found a 16-year-old boy who got lost Monday while driving to his family's farm.

Ja Phillips, a waitress at the Trail's Inn Cafe in Ashton, said about 15 truckers and a number of other travelers also spent much of Wednesday waiting out the storm.

"We went through a lot of coffee today. I guess we even sold some of it," she said.

Bill Lick, an Ashton video dealer, said blizzards bring out some of his best customers.

"Somehow, even if it is on their snowmobiles, people always seem to be able to get into town to pick up videos. If the farmers aren't in early, I know it must be a real bad storm."

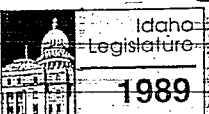

Idaho Health, welfare increases may only be start of budget spiral

BOISE (AP) — Legislative budget writers were warned Thursday that the 12.3 percent increase Gov. Cecil Andrus is seeking in health and welfare spending is just the beginning of a budget spiral that will grip the state well into the 1990s.



"You can expect to see large increases next year and the year after," budget analyst Dick Burns told the Joint Finance Appropriations Committee. "I suspect in the decade of the '90s you will see increases in this program and other social programs."

In a 2 1/2-hour presentation to the panel, Health and Welfare Director Richard Donovan detailed the increases in general tax spending proposed by Andrus, pointing out that in many instances the decisions were effectively out of the governor's hands.

"This is driven by federal mandates and the need to prevent more expensive problems down the road," Donovan said. "We're asking for some sizeable appropriations...to tackle some enormous responsibilities."

Andrus proposed general tax spending by the department of \$89.1 million for the year that begins July 1, with another \$240 million coming from the federal government and other sources. The bulk of the general tax increase is for welfare programs and the government's assault on child abuse, but he also outlined expansion of the environmental quality staff in the first phase of increased state oversight of the Idaho National

Engineer Laboratory. Still, the governor's proposal is \$21 million below the request originally submitted by Donovan, the cutback prompted solely by limited tax resources.

"Obviously, he's very prudent," Donovan told the committee. "We know we're not the only kids on the block... We knew going in we would not have all the things we felt were needed in the state. The governor's budget is my budget."

Justice Shepard still in hospital

BOISE (AP) — Allan Shepard, chief justice of the Idaho Supreme Court, remained hospitalized Thursday after suffering chest pains.

Rita Ryan, a spokeswoman at St. Luke's Regional Medical Center, said doctors ruled out a heart attack after conducting tests, and the 66-year-old Shepard was resting comfortably. He had been moved from the coronary care unit, but Ms. Ryan said it was uncertain when he would be released from the hospital.

INEL burns 'mixed waste'

IDAHO FALLS — A waste incinerator at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory has begun burning "mixed waste," a combination of low-level radioactive and hazardous wastes.

The Waste Experimental Reduction Facility processed 420 pounds of mixed waste on Tuesday, Dan Sanow, WERF program manager, said Thursday.

Opening of a similar facility at the Rocky Flats plant in Colorado has been slowed by environmental concerns.

Processing this mixture in the WERF incinerator marks another Department of Energy step in finding safe and environmentally sound methods of waste disposal, the DOE's Idaho operations office said in a press release.

The WERF facility has been incinerating low-level radioactive waste for more than three years. Sanow said the same unit is used to handle the mixed waste.

"We just kind of entered a new phase," he said.

Most of the 420 pounds of waste burned on Tuesday was contaminated plywood. Sanow said the unit has not handled any waste since Tuesday.

Some mixed waste — such as min-

erals or soils — are impossible to incinerate in the WERF unit. The incinerator can be used to handle contaminated materials such as paper products and protective clothing. "There will be more mixed waste in the future that the INEL does generate," said Brenda Mikkola, chief of DOE-Idaho's waste management branch.

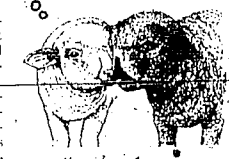
After the mixed wastes are incinerated, the ash is stored in cement and disposed of at the site's low-level waste disposal area at the Radioactive Waste Management Complex. Solidifying the ash in cement neutralizes the hazardous characteristics of the waste, the DOE says. Storing the incinerated ash in cement is approved by the Environmental Protection Agency.

The DOE has said the incineration process can reduce metallic waste to 1 percent of its original volume.

A similar incinerator at the Rocky Flats Plant in Colorado has generated a storm of controversy. Opponents of that plant claim air emissions from the facility could be a health threat to surrounding communities.

The INEL facility includes two filter systems to treat emissions. Sanow said. One unit cleans particulates from the incinerated air and a second removes radioactive particles.

Ag chairman pushes conservation

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Kika de la Garza, chairman of the House Agriculture Committee, urged farmers Thursday to buy crop insurance, and follow "every known practice of moisture conservation" because critical drought conditions still prevail across portions of the Midwest, the West and South Texas.

De la Garza, a Texas Democrat, and Norton D. Strommen, chief meteorologist for the Agriculture Department, said that they are concerned about the winter wheat crop but that with good early spring rains, this year's harvest could be a good crop.

Specific areas of concern they listed are the Texas and Oklahoma panhandles, South Texas rangeland and pockets of the Corn Belt from eastern Iowa and western Illinois southward into Kansas.

"Although recent snow in the West is a positive sign, it is not anything that would ease the situation," de la Garza said.

Contractors describe giving freebies

WASHINGTON (AP) — Contractors seeking business on the Navajo Nation Reservation in Arizona told a Senate investigative panel Thursday they had provided free airplane rides, cash payments and other favors to the tribe's chairman.

The allegations came from two white construction company owners and a Navajo who testified under immunity that they had set up dummy firms headed by Indians whose sole purpose was to qualify for jobs reserved for the minority group.

"It was something I felt like was expected on the reservation," said Franz A. Springer, who heads an Albuquerque, N.M., construction company bearing his name and who said he had written thousands of dollars worth of checks for Navajo chairman Peter MacDonald.

MacDonald has denied he has acted improperly. A worker in the Navajo office in Window Rock, Ariz., said a response was being prepared to the testimony.

Jury pool for North's trial growing

WASHINGTON (AP) — With patience and solicitude, judge and lawyers in Oliver L. North's Iran-Contra trial slowly worked Thursday to build a panel of potential jurors who knew nothing of the former Marine or only vaguely that he'd been "somehow messing up."

They had managed by mid-afternoon to qualify 22 residents of the District of Columbia for a pool of 50 from which the final jury of 12 and six alternates will be chosen, possibly next week.

U.S. District Judge Gerhard Gesell, North lawyer Brendan Sullivan, and chief trial prosecutor John Keeker took turns at questioning prospective jurors who had said on a written questionnaire that they had not watched, listened to or read accounts of the Iran-Contra case.

Drug suspect dies of cardiac arrest

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) — A drug suspect whose arrest sparked an hour-long rock-and-bottle-throwing melee died of cardiac arrest while in police custody, authorities said Thursday.

The predominantly black neighborhood was calm as lay after about 100 officers in riot gear quelled the outbreak Wednesday night by 70 to 150 young people that followed the arrest of Edgar Allen Price, 40, in an undercover bust.

It was the latest of at least a half-dozen violent outbreaks in the College Hill section in the past two years and the second in Florida in two weeks.

Price, who struggled violently during his arrest, died of cardiac arrest and had not been beaten or choked, Deputy Chief Thomas DePols said at a news conference announcing preliminary autopsy results.

Crew escapes Air Force jet crash

KIRBY, Vt. (AP) — An Air Force FB-111 fighter-bomber jet crashed and exploded Thursday in a wooded area in northeastern Vermont, but the two crewmen aboard parachuted to safety just seconds before it hit the ground.

The plane, a medium-range fighter-bomber with a two-man crew, was based at the Air Force base in Plattsburgh, N.Y., which is about 80 miles west of the crash site.

Senior Airman John Gardner, a public information officer at the air base, confirmed that both crewmen survived the crash, which occurred shortly before noon.

Senators delay vote, check Tower further

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Armed Services Committee postponed Thursday's expected vote on the nomination of John Tower, and the panel's top Republican said a meeting had been scheduled with the FBI concerning President Bush's choice as defense secretary.

Nunn had said a day earlier that he expected a favorable vote Thursday. But he said Thursday that "The file is still not complete and there are members now who have made a request to review certain items in the files, so we will not be voting today."

He refused to identify the source of the information or how many sources there were. Nunn said he and Sen. John Warner, R-Va., ranking Republican on the panel, met Thursday with the FBI and Sherrill Marshall, assistant to White House counsel G. Harshbarger, to review the new information.

China, USSR nearer normal ties

BEIJING (AP) — China and the Soviet Union reached agreement Thursday on many aspects of the conflict in Cambodia, which has clouded efforts to end 30 years of blood between the two communist giants.

Soviet Embassy spokesman V.V. Dubin said the consensus removed Cambodia as an impediment to normalization of ties.

The Chinese were more cautious. Li Zhaoning, spokesman for the Chinese Foreign Ministry, said the Cambodian question "is still a major item for the bilateral discussions."

Foreign Minister Qian Qichen said the nations agreed "on many aspects of the problem."

"Our understanding has been increased, as have the number of points we agree upon," he said in a speech Thursday night at a banquet

for his Soviet counterpart, Eduard Shevardnadze.

Shevardnadze arrived Wednesday for a three-day visit to plan the first China-Soviet summit in 30 years.

The foreign ministers agreed Thursday that international supervision is needed to ensure peace in Cambodia after Vietnam ends its occupation, which began in late 1978 with an invasion that replaced the Chinese-backed Khmer Rouge with a pro-Hanoi regime.

Last month, China and Vietnam agreed in principle that Vietnam would withdraw its troops from Cambodia by September and that China would gradually reduce its aid to the guerrilla groups.

China has called for an armed supervisory force to oversee the withdrawal, but Vietnam has rejected that plan.

Qian and Shevardnadze agreed the guerrilla factions and the Vietnamese-backed government should be allowed to determine Cambodia's political makeup without outside interference. But both countries implied they want a say in Cambodia's interim government, which will undoubtedly affect the future Cambodian state.

Details of the consensus' remaining points were not released.

The Soviet news agency Tass reported the two sides also agreed to set up a group to negotiate reduction of arms and troops in the border areas, the site of a small war in 1969.

In a speech later, Shevardnadze called for joint ventures between China and the Soviet Union, cooperation in science and technology and making their border into a region of "peace ... and cooperation."

Botha quits as S. Africa party leader

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — President P.W. Botha resigned Thursday as leader of the governing National Party but said he will carry on as the country's leader after he recuperates from a stroke.

Education Minister F.W. de Klerk was narrowly elected as the new leader of the party — which has held power for 40 years — and consolidating his status as the favorite to become the next president.

Botha, 73, told party officials in a letter that he was resigning the party post, which he assumed in 1978, to concentrate on his presidential duties and to distance the party from partisan politics. He did not elaborate.

He is recuperating at his home in Cape Town from the Jan. 18 stroke that weakened his left arm and left leg. Doctors said Thursday Botha was recovering rapidly and taking daily walks, but that he will need at least one more month of rest before he can return to work.

Constitutional Development Minister Chris Heunis was appointed acting president during Botha's recovery, but he placed third in Thursday's vote for a new party leader behind de Klerk and Finance Minister Barend du Plessis.

As education minister, de Klerk 52, has tried to avoid ideological labels and has not been associated with any major innovations. Last year, he proposed controversial steps to reduce financial aid to universities that allowed demonstrations in protest of South Africa's apartheid system of racial separation.

As leader of the National Party in Transvaal Province, de Klerk has tried to halt defections to the extreme-right Conservative Party. He supports Botha's policies of slow-paced reform that would lead to limited power-sharing with blacks, who are in the majority but have no vote in national affairs.

Soviet officer in Pact post

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviet Marshal Viktor Kulikov has been replaced as commander of Warsaw Pact forces by Gen. Pyotr Lushev, a Soviet first deputy defense minister. Tass announced Thursday.

Kulikov, 67, had been the commander of forces from the sovietized Warsaw Pact since 1977.

According to Western observers, the Warsaw Pact commander is not responsible for direct command over the armed forces of the Soviet Union's East bloc allies in combat, but supervises their integration and compatibility with the Soviet military.

Tass reported Kulikov had asked to be relieved of the post of Warsaw Pact commander, and said he was appointed as the position of general inspector of the group of general inspectors at the Soviet Defense Ministry.

Police end clash

KINGSTON, Jamaica (AP) — Police using tear gas broke up a confrontation between rival political supporters after two women were shot to death in what appeared to be politically motivated killings.

The trouble broke out Wednesday afternoon in Spanish Town, 15 miles northwest of the capital of Kingston following separate killings of two women working for opposing parties in the Feb. 14 election campaign.

Thai police raid drug refinery

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) — About 60 border patrol policemen raided a heroin refinery in the north and battled its defenders, forcing them to flee into the jungle, a border officer said Thursday.

Up to 20 men opened rifle fire on the policemen as they moved in on the refinery Wednesday in Chiang Mai province about 500 miles north

of Bangkok. Police Maj. Gen. Kovit Wattana said.

He said fighting lasted for 20 minutes before the defenders retreated into the jungle. No casualties were reported.

Police seized 33 pounds of high-grade heroin, as well as two hand grenades and 1,200 rounds of ammunition.

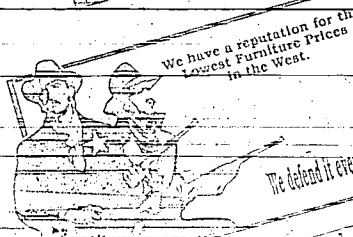

IRS pursues back taxes from local professionals

TWIN FALLS — The Internal Revenue Service is pursuing back taxes from dozens of local professionals after a federal appeals court invalidated a tax shelter.

A three-judge panel of the 9th U.S. Court of Appeals recently ruled that Professional and Executive Leasing Inc., a local corporation formed to provide tax benefits to dozens

of local professionals, was not the legal employer of the professionals.

Therefore, it could not offer retirement plans to the 47 or more doctors, lawyers and businessmen who signed contracts with the corporation.

"The IRS is working through individual settlement cases as expeditiously as possible," said Macy Trudgen, IRS spokeswoman.

Professional Leasing's attorney, Thomas G. Walker Jr., clashed with the Internal

Revenue Service over the amount of supervision Professional Leasing must exercise to prove an employer-employee relationship.

Walker, who formerly practiced in Twin Falls, did not return phone calls this week.

Professional Leasing advertised its business as an employer-leasing operation. It hired professionals and loaned them back to professional practices or businesses — generally their own.

The arrangement, according to Profes-

sional Leasing's literature, provided a "very liberal fringe benefit package and retirement plan" without having to offer the same benefits to office employees.

Walker argued that the professionals covered by Professional Leasing were employees of the corporation, who could be fired or reassigned.

The IRS, the U.S. Tax Court and the 9th Circuit Court disagreed.

"The right to control ... was at best illusory,"

wrote 9th Circuit Judge Robert Boche.

"Almost all of the professionals were leased back to the practices they came from and they owned part of these practices," the court reasoned in a five-page opinion.

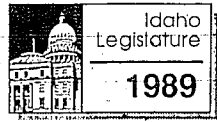
Professional Leasing had no reason to reassign or fire one of its professionals unless the practice the professional worked at became disastituted — an unlikely scenario, Boche wrote.

Ed panel delays decision on plans

BOISE — A package of proposals to encourage school consolidation met some opposition Thursday from state representatives who questioned its cost and effectiveness.

The package is the least controversial of three plans to mandate or encourage consolidation the Legislature is considering this week.



The House Education Committee Thursday delayed a decision on whether to consider the package of proposals, instead asking the state Department of Education to return with two amended versions of a package. One would be similar, but make technical corrections. The other would drop a provision to provide state financing for new school buildings required by consolidated districts.

The state Department of Education proposed:

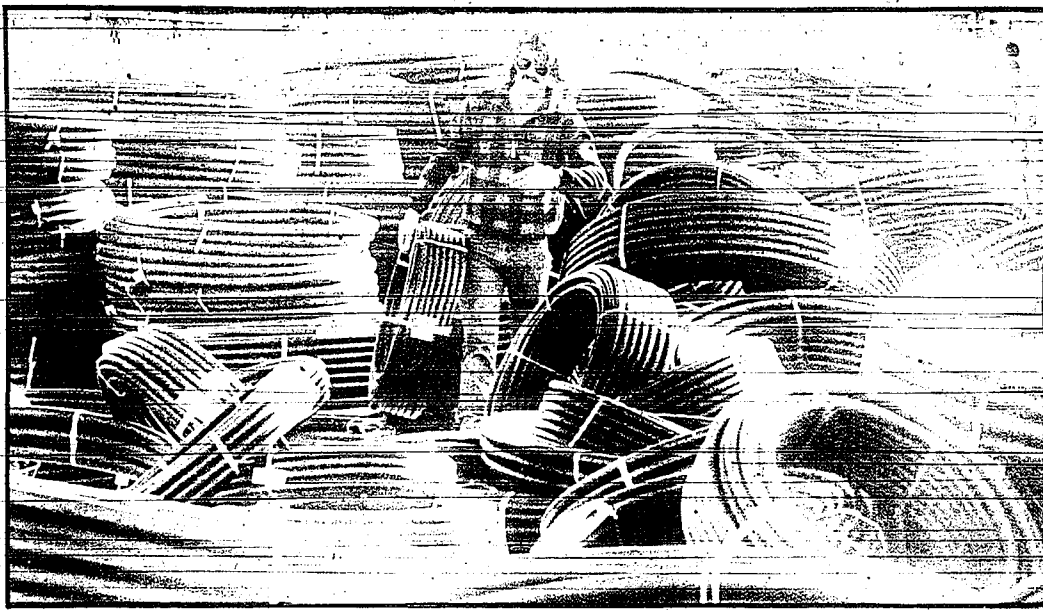
- If the consolidation plan calls for a new school building, the state would pick up interest payments. The program would be limited to a 15-year, \$5 million debt.

- Combined school districts would be guaranteed funding for seven years at the rate the separate districts were funded before consolidation. Now combined districts must apply to the state for the larger appropriation, and the state's policy has been to begin cutting back the funding by the fifth year. Because the state education funding formula gives small schools more money per student than large schools, consolidation tends to lose state money than schools would receive separately.
- The state would pay for consolidation feasibility studies and plans, presumably even if no consolidation followed.

- Existing bond debt would remain with the original, unconsolidated school districts. Now with a two-thirds vote, the consolidated district can assume the debt of the old districts. However, the committee has asked for an attorney's opinion on the constitutionality of assigning bond debt to "only part of a taxing district."

- "I'm still looking for some justification for consolidation," said Dick Davis, R-Reburg. "Can you prove it?"

30 Buhl students could get to see science in action

BUHL — Thirty Buhl students may be able to participate in an innovative scientific experiment.

The school district has been invited to British Columbia, Canada, to witness live satellite broadcasts of underwater explorations by Jason,

the submersible, research robot that scientists used in 1985 to find the wreck of the Titanic.

In May Jason will explore the floor of the Mediterranean Sea, a joint project of the U.S. Navy, National Geographic, Robert Ballard, who headed the Titanic team, and others.

The Buhl School Board Monday unanimously voted to allow Buhl stu-

dents to make the trip. Science teacher Kathleen Murphy will begin fund-raising projects for the trip.

"I think it would really be a coup for Buhl," Superintendent Eugene Pyles said in urging the board to approve the trip. "It might even inspire some students to seek careers in science."

"This is certainly a once-in-a-life-

time opportunity for students of our rural community," Murphy told the board. "They will have a chance to learn much about the rapidly expanding field of oceanography, to participate in the newest research being covered by National Geographic and to witness Ballard and Idaho to our Canadian neighbors."

Still to be decided is who will go on

the trip. The program allows only 30 students from Buhl so 15 will be chosen from the high school and 15 from the middle school. Students who go must have an interest in science, be good representatives of Buhl and agree to make up any school work missed and complete the requirements of the project.

Probe continues of alleged embezzlement of charity

TWIN FALLS — Partial findings of an investigation into alleged embezzlement at the local United Way have been forwarded to the county prosecutor's office, police said Thursday.

However, neither that investigation nor an audit of the agency's books has been completed, so no formal action is expected until next week at the earliest, authorities said.

The subject of the probe is a part-time United Way employee accused of forging at least three checks and embezzling an undisclosed amount of cash, said Fritz Wenderlich, the agency's attorney. The woman employee, who worked less than six months as a secretary-bookkeeper, was fired in late December, Wenderlich said.

After she was fired, the United Way asked McMullen Melphoe & Co., a Twin Falls accounting firm, to audit the agency's books, Wenderlich said. Accountant Paul Nielsen said Thursday that he could not estimate when the audit will be completed.

Public Safety Director Tim Qualls said his investigators "have got a pretty good case

right now," but are waiting for one other piece of evidence before proceeding further.

Twin Falls County Prosecutor K. Ellen Bayer declined to comment on the case.

Wenderlich said the fired employee has not paid restitution, but the United Way carries fidelity insurance that probably would cover

the loss.

Court of Appeals reverses decision

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Court of Appeals says it is unclear whether Lewiston police acted properly in 1985 when they pursued a man into his home and seized him there without an arrest warrant.

So the court on Thursday reversed 2nd District Judge Ronald Schilling's decision upholding a magistrate's refusal to suppress evidence used against Milton S. Wren.

The case was returned to Nez Perce County Magistrate D.K. Warden for findings on whether the officers arrested Wren before he entered his house and, if not, whether other circumstances justified pursuing him into the house.

According to court documents, Wren was in his back yard on Feb. 11, 1985, when a neighbor complained about noise. Lewiston police officers told him he would be cited for disturbing the peace unless he quieted down.

Wren walked into his house, but a few moments later reappeared. After directing some abusive language toward the officers, he began to re-enter his house.

The officers pursued him, but the Court of Appeals said the record was unclear on whether they told Wren to stop.

will save any money or improve education.

"Consolidation is unlikely to save money, at least initially," said Robert Dutton, associate state superintendent for finance. But consolidation would increase offerings to high school students, he said.

"We already have things in place to encourage people to consider consolidation," said Rep. Herb Steyer, R-Boise. But school districts haven't been rushing to take advantage of it. If small school patrons believed consolidation would improve local education, surely they would have used existing incentives, he said.

"I can't get really excited about the increased incentives, he said.

Other representatives questioned the costs of the incentives, particularly paying interest on new buildings.

Dutton estimated a \$5 million building could cost the state \$400,000 in interest the first year. The state subcommittee that drew up the proposals would like the money to come from the state building fund, which now is empty.

The money would be more likely to come off the top of the state appropriation to all school districts. That means all other districts in the state would receive less money, a concern to several of the House committee members.

Dutton estimated the feasibility studies and plans would cost no more than \$5,000 each. Rules and regulations that could limit the amount paid by the state or decide what districts would be eligible would be developed by the state Department of Education.

since the county commissioners theoretically meet in open session 40 hours a week, he did not think anyone except the commissioners would be there.

"I assumed they (the press) would not be there," Wondrich said. Instead of meeting face to face, the city and county will write letters back and forth, Wondrich said. The letters will be open to the public, he said.

The city will mail a proposed amendment change to the county and the county will have a chance to respond, he said.

Wondrich said the city's impact area, an unincorporated area slated for future urban growth, is affected by both city and county law. Therefore, the two government bodies must agree on changes and amend zoning ordinances accordingly.

Before any changes could be made, the city and county would have to hold public hearings, Wondrich said.

He said one of the proposed amendments would be to change the

agricultural zone's name to the transitional zone to conform more accurately with its use.

Wondrich said the "meeting would have been preliminary to future rezoning meetings dealing with possible agricultural zone boundary changes, which have not been altered in 10 years."

He said an issue is whether the agricultural zone boundaries reflect the city's actual growth.

Jones has previously said that most of the city's growth has been northeast, not south of Twin Falls as predicted by city leaders in 1979.

In previous discussions between city or county leaders, no one has suggested a need to change the boundaries, Wondrich said.

Jones' attempts to have the zoning ordinance changed to allow dairies and feed lots by special-use permits were turned down by the Planning and Zoning Commission in September, by the City Council in October and by the Board of Appeals of the city's impact area in November. All of the decisions followed heated public hearings.

Tourism tax looks headed for defeat

BOISE — Supporters of a half-cent tourism tax will be back in the Legislature today with an amended proposal, but even the legislative committee chairman on the subject isn't optimistic about its chances.

Tourism officials, led by the Idaho Innskeepers Association, have agreed not to tax taxi take-outs, food prepared, in supermarkets and ready-to-eat food sold at convenience stores. They have also removed the tax from movies.

Remaining in the proposed bill is a half-cent-per-dollar tax on restaurants, motels, bar drinks, motel rooms, campgrounds, auto rentals and guide fees.

Carl Wilgus, head of travel promotion for the Department of Commerce, estimated the amended tax proposal would reduce income for tourism promotions to \$32 million from \$3.7 million. The state currently collects about \$2 million annually from a 2 percent tax on motel rooms and private campgrounds. That tax would be dropped under the new proposal.

Thinks tourism tax doomed

Now that tourism officials have begun removing items from the tax, the bill is probably doomed, said Rep. Gary Robbins, R-Twin Falls, who chaired the House Commerce, Tourism and Industry subcommittee on the tourism tax.

"Anything you shrink from a broad-

based tax you begin to lose support," he said. More and more businesses also want exemptions then.

"It could pass if people jump on board, but I don't see that happening," he said.

Supporters did not have industry support when they brought the bill to the Legislature, he said. Although the Idaho Travel Council is now giving the bill unanimous support, Robbins said he believes it is too late in the session to get it through tourism and tax committees and onto the floors of both houses.

Motel owners have been the strongest proponents of spreading the tax to more industries that benefit from it.

The strongest opponents have been grocery store owners who say tourism promotions benefit them little and that there would be no efficient way to tax only deli or other take-out food. But restaurant owners have argued that they are competing for dollars spent on convenience foods purchased in stores and some grocery items must also be taxed out of fairness.

House could act on Hawkins measure

BOISE - The House Agriculture Committee voted to send to the House floor emergency legislation drafted to save Hawkins Co. Ltd. lien holders \$800 each.

The bill, sponsored by Rep. Doug Jones, R-Ellet, would lift a requirement that growers send copies of their lien filings to all other lien holders by certified mail. At almost \$2 a letter and with more than 400 lien holders, the cost of that request is prohibitive, Jones said.

It would ease the burden on people who already have enormous amounts of money tied up and are having to spend more for mailing, Jones said.

The bill would also make changes in filing procedures. All liens against a company would be filed in one courthouse, depending on where the company's principal office is. Lien holders would then be able to find all

liens against the company in one place.

Jones is asking that the bill take effect as soon as the governor signs it. If the bill is approved quickly, it could prevent a second round of mailing costs for Hawkins lien holders this month. Idaho requires liens to be refilled every six months.

Hawkins bean warehouse is in bankruptcy proceedings and under state control.

The change is needed, White said, because some of Idaho's high-paying jobs in natural resource industries have been replaced by lower-paying jobs.

The committee also gave preliminary approval for printing and introduction of legislation from the Association of Idaho Counties to make all county commission terms four years. At present, some commissioners are elected to two-year terms and others to four-year terms.

"County government is becoming very complicated," said Hamrick county Commissioner Tom Johnson. "Two years on the job doesn't allow time to learn the workings of county government."

He said all county officials used to serve two-year terms, but over the years the Idaho Constitution has been amended to the point that only commissioners are elected to two-year terms.

House panel considers minimum wage

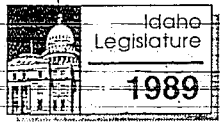
BOISE (AP) - Rep. Gino White says that this time, he'd like to see legislation raising the Idaho minimum wage approved, not killed.

The Cataldo Democrat took a proposal to boost the Idaho minimum wage for the first time in 12 years to the House State Affairs Committee. The panel voted Thursday to print and introduce the legislation.

Last session, White went before the conservative House Business Committee with a similar bill, boosting the minimum wage from \$2.30, where it has been since 1977, to \$3 per hour, effective July 1. The committee killed the proposal last year.

When asked by State Affairs members why the proposal was being brought before a different committee, White said, "My intent is to get it passed."

The state minimum wage applies only to jobs not covered by the federal minimum wage. It also does not



apply to farm jobs.

Since the Idaho minimum wage was last increased, White said, the Consumer Price Index has gone up 97 percent, which means \$2.30 per hour buys only half as much as it did in 1977.

Three dollars an hour is about the federal poverty level, he said. "It is not excessive by any means," White said. "I can demonstrate a need for it."

At \$2.30 per hour, White said, it would take a person 13 months to earn enough to pay for a week-long stay in a hospital.

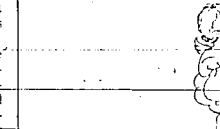

Drought picture looks encouraging as snowpack mounts to two-thirds

BOISE (AP) - The prospects for a drought-ending spring runoff continue to improve with about two-thirds of Idaho's annual snowpack now on the ground.

Jerry Beard, snow survey supervisor for the U.S. Soil Conservation Service in Boise, said Feb. 1 snowpack levels generally were normal or above normal statewide.

"We're not totally out of the woods yet, but it's certainly becoming more encouraging with each month that we go through with normal or above normal conditions," Beard said Thursday.

A few snow survey readings were unavailable because of the severe winter storm that lashed eastern Idaho on Wednesday, but Beard said enough data were available to conclude that healthy precipitation in early January put the state back on track for at least normal runoff.

Snowpack levels measured Wednesday were slightly above normal in southwest Idaho and a little below normal in extreme southeastern Idaho. But the rest of the state had snowpacks very near normal for Feb. 1.

Still, Beard cautioned that about one-third of Idaho's yearly snowpack has yet to accumulate. It is expected to reach its peak in early to mid-April, and precipitation in the form of rain in May and June also will play a role in determining the runoff levels.

The Feb. 1 measurements indicated basins from the Salmon River north to Priest River ranged from 95 to 105 percent of normal snowpack.

In south-central Idaho, the Weiser River Basin was 105 percent of normal, the Payette River 100 percent, the Boise River 105 percent, Big Wood River 95 percent, Little Wood River

105 percent, Big Lost River 93 percent and Little Lost River 102 percent.

In eastern Idaho, Beard said the Henry's Fork River Basin was about 120 percent of normal, the Teton River 113 percent, the Snake River above, Jackson Reservoir 119 percent, the Grays Lake Outlet 95 percent, the Salt River 71 percent. For all of the Snake River above Palisades Reservoir, the accumulation amounted to 109 percent of normal.

Snowpack in Willow Creek Basin was 122 percent of normal, in the Blaine River Basin 105 percent, and the Portneuf River 107 percent.

To the west, the Oakley Reservoir Basin was at 132 percent of normal, the Salmon Falls Creek Basin was estimated at 125 to 130 percent, the Brunson River 132 percent and the Duchesne River 153 percent.

Market prices drift; Dow down 4.46

NEW YORK—The stock market bounced back and forth aimlessly Thursday as traders awaited the first statistical gauge of how the economy started off 1989.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks closed at 2,833.75, down 4.46 points from 2,838.21 on Wednesday.

Advancing issues outnumbered declining ones by about 7 to 1 in nationwide trading of New York Stock Exchange-listed stocks, with 771 up, 662 down and 496 unchanged.

Volume on the floor of the Big Board came to 183.43 million shares, down from 215.54 million in the previous session. A majority of committed volume in NYSE-listed issues

including trades in these stocks on regional exchanges and in the over-the-counter market, totaled 276.81 million shares.

Analysts said money managers at investing institutions still seemed to be doing some catch-up buying to participate in the market's rally.

Stock prices began rising more than two months ago, many cautious traders were caught by surprise holding large amounts of cash reserves.

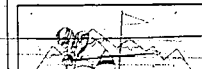

'Gone With the Wind' celebrates its 50th anniversary in style

ATLANTA — Rhett Butler is gone and Tara's a mess, but Scarlett O'Hara still knows one thing: Tomorrow is another day.

'Gone With the Wind' was a mess, too, but David O. Selznick's blockbuster — the world's most popular film — has been restored and will rise yet again this month for a 50th anniversary tour that's already selling out theaters.

Since its Dec. 16, 1939, premiere, the popularity of the movie based on Margaret Mitchell's novel about the Civil War and Reconstruction has never faded.

It broke box-office records by grossing \$14 million its first year, and new generations flocked to carefully spaced reissues in 1947, 1954, 1961 and 1967. The 1976 television debut was the largest audience ever to tune in for a theatrical feature, with 33.9 million homes watching. The film has so far grossed \$76.7 million at the box office, and had been the No. 1 top-grossing movie until 'The Sound of Music' edged ahead in 1965.

A widescreen version made in the 1960s turned 'Gone With the Wind' into a colorful mess. The colorization ruined the color and composition of the movie, which had been made in Technicolor. Promoters say the newly restored version brings back the color and majesty of the original.

Television entrepreneur Ted Turner, who owns the film, is planning a 42-city tour in American movie houses for the restored print. The 3½-hour film, which won eight Academy Awards including best picture, is already sold out, with tickets at \$10 and \$12.50.

The day of its premiere in 1939, the governor declared a holiday and more than a million people crowded into downtown Atlanta as Clark Gable and Vivien Leigh led a parade of stars down Peachtree Street to Loew's Grand Theater, which was decked out with a white marble facade reminiscent of Tara, Scarlett's plantation. They were celebrating the film version of a hometown writer's Pulitzer Prize-winning epic.

Turner acquired the rights to the movie in 1985 when he bought MGM-UA Entertainment Corp., with its massive film library for \$1.5 billion. He daily began showing the David O. Selznick blockbuster in 1987 at one of the six theaters at CNN Center, the headquarters of his cable-TV empire, a shop in the atrium offers 'GWTW' memorabilia. He

also launched his 24-hour TV channel, Turner Network Television, with you guessed it — 'Gone With the Wind.' 'It's his favorite movie,' said Turner Broadcasting System spokesman Frank Miller, so Turner was 'only too happy' to foot the \$250,000 bill for the complex restoration process using the original negatives.

'The situation before, was that they were making prints from masters that were several stages removed from the original negatives,' Miller said. 'There were prints floating around that were four or five generations removed.'

For the restored version, Turner obtained every bit of negative he could in the best possible condition from Eastman House in Rochester, N.Y., and then printed 'under optimal conditions,' he said.

'What really comes out is a better print than has ever been seen before, even since '39. They [Selznick's crew] had wonderful equipment for recording and sound, but not as good equipment for printing it.'

Also restored is the original sweep title, which moved across the screen from right to left in the 1939 version. It had been replaced by a black title, showing all four words at once, in remakes during the 1960s.

The anniversary celebration comes just one year before the anticipated publication of the long-awaited sequel to Mitchell's novel. After fighting for decades to keep others from continuing the story of Scarlett and Rhett, the Mitchell estate authorized, a sequel in 1987 and last year chose Alexandra Ripley, a Virginia author, to write it.

Warner Books paid \$194 million for the rights to publish the sequel. Turner's staff is putting together events to celebrate the film's 50th anniversary in December.

'There will be a ball of some kind in Atlanta, Miller said, but it's not for sure right now what exactly is going to be done.'

Until Turner bought the rights, Atlanta had few permanent reminders that it was the home of Mitchell, who had a Pulitzer Prize for the 1936 novel that has sold 25 million copies. Efforts to save the apartment where she wrote much of the book are tied up in court.

The 'Loews,' which opened as an opera house in 1892, was gutted by fire in 1978. The restored version of 'GWTW' will be available on videocassette for home use.

TWIN FALLS - Eberle Umbach, the 1988-89 Idaho Writer-Residence, will give a reading of her works and lead a discussion on literature and writing tonight at Judi's Bookstore, downtown Twin Falls.

The reading will begin at 7:30 p.m. The event is open to the public.



Umbach's appointment as Writer-Residence is supported by a grant from the Idaho Commission on the Arts. Twin Falls is one of five Idaho communities she is scheduled to visit during her spring tour.

During her presentation, Umbach will read and discuss selections of her own poetry and fiction as well as the works of other writers.

While a student at Oberlin College, Ubach received the Snell Scholarship Award for fiction. She received a master's degree in fiction from Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Md. in 1986.

What if Groucho Marx had been Rhett Butler?

NEW YORK (AP) - Rhett Butler with a wide, pointed-on mustache, meandering eyebrows, eye glasses and a cigar?

Well, if author Margaret Mitchell had her way and had been really serious about it, it would have been Groucho Marx who swept Miss Scarlett up all those stairs for a taste of Southern lust instead of Clark Gable.

With all the Hollywood hype to recruit stars for "Gone With the Wind," Mitchell, who wrote the Pulitzer Prize-winning best seller, kept her distance because "she feared" fellow Southerners would blame her if the movie didn't turn out well. She didn't want to help write the script, wouldn't participate in the casting search for stars and finally coughed up her own candidate: the rival comic.

As one of the most popular movies of all time, "Gone With the Wind" is awash with such nuggets:

Did you know, for example, that the winner of eight Academy Awards was panned by some critics?

"A major event in the history of the industry but only a minor event in motion picture art. There are moments when the two categories meet on good terms, but the long stretches between are filled with more spectacular offerings," wrote Franz Hoellering in the Nation.

Here are some other "Gone With the Wind" factsoids:

- Two soundtracks were released with the 1939 film - one for domestic distribution and one for overseas.
- In the international version there was strident marching music and the visual was an elaborate description of the North-South conflict. The domestic version had a sweet version of "Dixie" and talked about the halcyon days in the South that are gone with the wind.
- Hattie McDaniel, who won an Academy Award for supporting actress for her role as the maid Mammy, kept her long, manicured fingernails in the movie as her own way of protesting the treatment of blacks in Hollywood. She was out, she wanted the world to know, a maid. She was the first black actor ever nominated for an Oscar and the first to ever win.
- Vivien Leigh refused to have any embraces with Gable when they first began shooting the movie because of a foul mouth odor caused by his dentures. He eventually remedied the problem.
- Cammie King Condon, who portrayed Bonnie Blue, Rhett and Scarlett's little girl, couldn't stop blinking while playing dead so a mask of her face was made and used over her real face. Also, it wasn't the actress who fell from the pony but a midge! And a blue-eyed boy played Bonnie Blue as an infant.
- Wally Pfunkett, the movie's costume designer, was given a box of thorns by a woman in Charleston, S.C., because during the Civil War, there were no metal pins and clothing was held together by the thorns.
- The film rights for the blockbuster were purchased for a mere \$50,000 in 1936.

has come to America to stay and now is working to land a contract with a major record company.

"White Line Fever," he says, is not trying to imitate other country bands. The musicians play mostly their original music and wear formal suits rather than jeans and cowboy hats.

"There's no point in coming here and trying to be a replica of the average country band," Robinson says. "We don't copy anybody whatsoever."

After touring the American East Coast for about seven months, the English band made their first trip out West, traveling 2,000 miles last week from Nashville to Los Angeles.

"The scenery is quite awesome," Robinson says of Nevada. "There's nothing like this in England. We thought the desert would be hot."

White Line Fever, named after a Merle Haggard truck-driving song, was started in England 12 years ago by brothers Kevin and Terry Thistlethwaite and their cousin Bob Nichols. All three are singing guitarists. Derek Vain plays drums and Robert Bee plays saxophone and keyboards.

Robinson says his band enjoys being a novelty group, even though the English accents disappear when the Thistlethwaite's sing. Some audiences don't believe the harmonizing band members are English until they actually speak, says Robinson.

"One other clue might give them away."

"We do a few Beate songs," he says. "They always go down well."

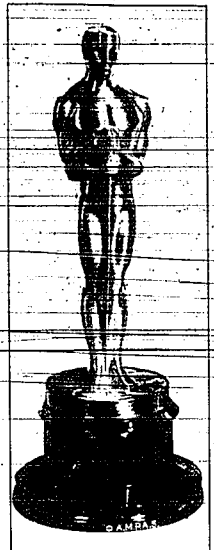

As Oscar time approaches, filmmakers court Academy

Melanie Griffith shines in movie 'Working Girl'

TWIN FALLS — The following are movie reviews of some of the films playing locally in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

WORKING GIRL (R): For those who missed the special Melanie Griffith blend of movie and down-to-earth sensuality in "Something Wild" and "Stormy Monday," this is a chance to meet her in the very best of company: romantically entangled with Harrison Ford, directed by Mike Nichols and in a savagely funny screenplay by Kevin Wade. It is a working-Cinderella story in which Griffith plays a more-than-bright Staten Islander with a force yen to climb out of the secretarial pool as the Wall Street brokerage job. Via Sigourney Weaver, Joan Cusack, Alec Baldwin and Olympia Dukakis.

BEACHES (PG-13): This adaptation of the novel by Iris Rainer Dart is supposed to be the story of an abiding friendship between two very different women. Bette Midler is inevitable casting for the novel's C.C. Bloom and therein everything right with the idea of Barbara Hershey as C.C.'s friend. But the movie is missing what the book had reams of: heart, connective tissue, sense, sensibility, a good ear and a bad mouth.

THE LAND BEFORE TIME BEGAN (G): This animation feature stars Littlefoot, a baby Brontosaurus, who will lose his mother and must find his way without her to the Great Valley, or starve. Director Don Bluth has gone to the trouble of giving very little children a sort of primer of dinosaur lore. It is nice that the Lucas Spielberg forces, who are the film's executive producers, are behind the idea of overcoming differences and pulling together — that the Stegosaurus can lie down with the Pterodactyl, so to speak. But do dinosaurs really lend themselves to outside-cuteness?

Edward James Olmos deserves more exposure in the Oscar race. Olmos' portrayal of a burnt high school teacher in that film earned him some critical acclaim and a Golden Globe nomination. But when it came to the annual ritual of studio campaigning for Oscar nominations, Warner Bros. bought only a handful of advertisements in the Hollywood trade papers.

A Warner spokesman insists that the film received the same treatment as the studio's other Oscar contenders. But Olmos' agent, Jim Cota, takes a different view. "We got absolutely no support from the studio. It's terrible," Cota said.

So Cota, the film's investors (who sold "Stand and Deliver" to Warners in a pick-up deal) and Olmos are pooling their money to buy ads in the Hollywood trade papers, asking members of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences to consider Olmos for a best actor Oscar. "We had to beat up Eddie over the head to do this," Cota said.

True, the Academy warns members about "advertisements," promotional gifts and other lobbying tactics, and Academy members love to expound at length about the integrity of their voting process. But many Hollywood insiders also concede that marketing campaigns do help shape the thinking of Academy members — though, not always in the manner that the studios intend.

This year, for example, Cannon has launched an aggressive campaign for its critically acclaimed "Little Dorrit," prompting some Oscar rare-earns to snipe that the studio's "ear-sh" advertisements work against the picture. Universal's marketers

thought Academy members would enjoy an elegant dinner before the studio's free screenings, but others say that strategy could backfire.

Marketing campaigns may be especially important this year. In contrast to past years, there has been a notable lack of agreement among the various critics' groups that bestow their own awards in advance of the Oscars, including the Hollywood foreign press, which handed out its Golden Globes awards Saturday.

"When there are no show-ins, it's open season for every studio's publicity department to spend lots of money," said producer Robert Radnitz.

Since November, the 4,632 voting members of the Academy have been bombarded by advertisements in the trade papers (principally Daily Variety and the Hollywood Reporter), publicized letters in their mailboxes and sound tracks passed out at screenings. Once the nominees are announced on Feb. 16, the volume of advertising will increase even further until the winners are announced March 29.

Here's a look at some of this year's strategies:

The bottom-line strategy: "Rain Man" is already considered a top contender for an Oscar nomination. But

MGM-UA isn't taking any chances. Colorful, poignant scenes from the film regularly fill up two-page ads in the trade papers, and at the Los Angeles cable systems.

MGM-UA is hoping that a few nominations will help "Rain Man" at the box office when it is released overseas in late February or early March. That same strategy worked wonders when "Monstrous" collected a smattering of nominations before going overseas last year.

The re-release strategy: One key to any Oscar campaign is to get voters to see the film. "The problem gets worse and worse," says producer Jerry Hershner, a 30-year Academy member. "How do you get people out of the house and in to see the picture?" This year, in addition to free screenings for Academy members, studios are re-releasing films in theaters close to Academy members' neighborhoods — "Who Framed Roger Rabbit," "A Cry in the Dark," "Bird," "Running on Emptiness" are among the re-releases.

Some films — like "Unbearable Lightness" — are also available on videocassette.

The quotable critics strategy: Any

film critics list out of the campaign for Clint Eastwood's "Bird" must be from Newsweek and NBC's "Today" share to the University of Texas' student newspaper, the Daily Texan.

Turner may colorize 'Citizen Kane'

CULVER CITY, Calif. (AP) — Orson Welles pleaded to a friend just before his death to preserve his 1941 classic "Citizen Kane," saying: "Don't let Ted Turner deface my movie with his crayons."

Turner isn't listening. His Turner Entertainment Co. said Monday it is seeking to tint the black-and-white account of a newspaper publisher, which many film critics consider the best American movie ever made.

Olsen said to me at lunch, about two weeks before he died — I remember this vividly: "Please do this for me. Don't let Ted Turner deface my movie with his crayons," said film director Henry Jaglom.

At the age of 25, Welles starred in,

wrote and directed the movie, his first feature film. He shared an Oscar for the script and was nominated for best director and actor. The film also starred Joseph Cotten, Agnes Moorehead and Everett Sloane.

Two companies are coloring test scenes of "Citizen Kane" to see if the process will work on the celebrated saga, a Turner spokeswoman said.

"The tests ... are to determine whether coloring is feasible at all — whether, we have, the elements required to do a top-quality job," spokeswoman Alison Hill said.

Ted Turner, head of the Turner broadcasting empire, has said previously that he wants to color "Citizen

Kane" but, he has been slowed by technical hurdles. No original 35mm print could be found, he said. Such prints are essential in making first-rate video copies employed in the computerized colorization process.

Turner obtained the rights to "Citizen Kane" when he acquired the 3,650-title film library of MGM in 1986.

Festival attracts many jazz musicians, singers

LEWISTON (AP) — The University of Idaho's Lionel Hampton-Cheyron Jazz Festival next month has attracted a long list of big names in jazz besides the legendary vibraphone player.

Two other stars of the jazz world performing in Moscow Feb. 23 are jazz and classical trumpeter Wynton Marsalis and singer Carmen McRae.

Saxophonist Stan Getz headlines

the Feb. 24 concert, joined by trumpeter Doc Cheatham and guitarist Kenny Burrell. The Feb. 25 concert will feature Hampton and his 17-piece New York Big Band. Hampton also will sit in on vibas Feb. 24.

The Ray Brown Trio will be back for all three nights, including pianist Gene Harris of Boise.

An international twist has been added, with a jazz duo from the Soviet

Union, including Leonid Sarsutov on saxophone and Leonid Vintskevich on piano.

Again, Hampton's name and good will is responsible for bringing the musicians together, said Lynn Skinner, festival director at Idaho.

"It's an exciting thing for young people and the adult population. I don't think they will go away with their hearts empty," Skinner said.

Peter Falk will keep familiar props for the return of 'Columbo' Monday

Why bother to ask? It has been 12 years since Peter Falk last played Columbo, the underpaid, untidy detective with the Central Homicide Division of the Los Angeles Police Department, and he returns to that role with the Feb. 6 debut of the "ABC Monday Mystery Movie." A dry-cleaning tag will not — repeat, not — be found, planned to the inside lining of his infamous raincoat. Columbo's rumpled raincoat is so legendary that it probably has just as much right to reside in the Smithsonian Institution as Achele Bunker's chair.

The unkempt raincoat is one of many elements of the original "Columbo" series, which originally ran as part of the rotating wheel of the "NBC Mystery Movie" from 1971-77, that will remain the same. "Columbo" returns as part of the rotating wheel of the "ABC Monday Mystery Movie." (The other two spokes are "B.L. Stryker," starring Burt Reynolds, and "Gideon Oliver," starring Lou Gossett Jr.)

"There are no major changes to 'Columbo' except what would be organic during the 12 years that have passed," says Richard Alan Simmons, who produced the original se-

ries and is the co-executive producer, along with Falk, of the revival. "It's the raincoat, the car, the cigar and the dog. One doesn't play tricks with that. The audience has made it very clear that they don't want any changes."

The organic changes Simmons mentions are mostly related to Falk's natural aging process. "Yes, you'll see the years have been added with Peter's use of glasses and his hair-color change," he says. "Yet this only adds to the richness of the character. Peter's really still the same."

Simmons says that what differentiates Columbo from the scores of television detective characters who have come and gone since 1977 is the characters and the show's personal style. "It's wall-to-wall relationship," Simmons says. "I don't mean cat and mouse. I mean the relationship between Columbo and the antagonist."

Columbo usually befriends his suspects, using his unpretentious demeanor to disarm them. Underneath the rumpled exterior lies an extra sharp, logical criminal-busting mind.

In the Feb. 6 premiere episode, "Columbo Goes to the Guillotine," the detective goes up against Elliot Blake (played by Anthony Andrews),

a brilliant but villainous psychic who has murdered a magician. It seems that the murder victim could have exposed Blake as a charlatan, thus ruining his chance to work on a secret government project. Blake believes he has committed the perfect crime. But once Columbo gets on the Blake case, you can forget about perfection.

Next month, in the second new episode, Columbo matches wits with someone Simmons calls "an accomplished young film director who is incredibly rich and successful. Among directors he's foremost — the most successful young director in the history of the medium." Fisher Stevens will play him.

Steven Spielberg, anyone? "Even if it was Spielberg, I think Columbo would outwit him," laughs Simmons.

On the Cover Peter Falk returns in his most memorable role — as Lt. Columbo — on the "ABC Monday Mystery Movie." It premieres on Feb. 6. "Columbo" will rotate with two new mysteries, "B. L. Stryker" and "Gideon Oliver."

Charles? He wasn't particularly skinny." — N.K.

A: This is one of the classic movie myths. "The Thin Man" referred to in the original 1934 film was a character played by Edward Ellis, in a relatively small role as the murder victim. The name became permanently stuck to Powell (or rather to Nick Charles) because in the ensuing series of movies about "The Thin Man," the title clearly referred to him — although the original "thin man" had been killed off in the original movie.

Q: I was saddened by the story of Drew Barrymore, the adorable child star of "E.T." who got into drugs and alcohol while still a youngster. Don't you wonder whether the movie business is a healthy one for a child?

— L.S.

A: For some children, it's been very, very bad. Judy Garland and Linda Blair come quickly to mind, but there have been many others. Linda Blair, the star of "The Exorcist," was sought by the FBI in connection with a drug ring and was put on probation for three years for conspiring to possess cocaine.

Q: Since Hollywood is always having a love affair with one or another British actress or actor, how come they don't import Twiggy again? She was good in the recent but mostly overlooked movie with Shirley Maclaine, "Madame Sousatzka." — S.D.

A: The Twig has had offers, but she's turned them down because she didn't want to be separated from Leigh Lawson, the actor she married last September. But she is now negotiating a deal to do a sitcom series in the U.S. which would guarantee a role for Lawson as well. Twiggy says, "I've seen too many show business marriages destroyed by long separations."

Q: Hasn't Bruce Willis been quietly promoting himself as the best-paid actor in Hollywood? — B.Y.

A: No one in Hollywood earns more than Sylvester Stallone or Eddie Murphy, both of whom are in the \$20-million-per-picture range.

Q: Isn't Gilda Radner seriously ill? Any idea how she's doing? — O.P.

A: Gilda was stricken with cancer about a year ago. She's a fighter and has been undergoing various treatments, most recently in New York. Everyone has high hopes she'll win her battle against that dread disease. The good news is that when she returned to Hollywood from Manhattan recently, she looked absolutely great.

Q: I still consider Hedy Lamarr the screen's all-time great beauty, and I was intensely interested to read that she'll sing on screen for the first time in a picture titled "Diamonds." Is this true? — C.H.

A: Not likely. Hedy has already sung on screen, notably in the comedy "My Favorite Spy" (1951). But I seriously doubt that she'll do "Diamonds" — or any other movie. Her recent life has been full of similar announcements, none of which has ever panned out. The main reason, I feel, is Lamarr's vanity and star's ego. Though she can still look like a million, she's not about to play somebody's grandmother, which, at age 74, is what she's realistically suited for.

I've seen a dancer come off stage after a beautiful performance only to curse the tiny imperfections. I'm a happy person. I couldn't go through life like that."

Switching careers, Signy took up modeling at I. Magnin's, and soon found herself in Paris, unable to speak a word of French.

"My years of discipline as a ballet dancer got me through," Signy confesses. "I learned the language, traveled all over Europe and then made a pair of videos with Huey Lewis and the News. Hollywood beckoned and while I was studying

Stars shine in 'Lonesome Dove'

NEW YORK — Durin. Just when you write off the whole damped network season, CBS comes along with a big ol' event, a four-night masterpiece of a Western, "Lonesome Dove."

The eight-hour miniseries begins Sunday and runs through Wednesday.

Readers who loved Larry McMurtry's Pulitzer Prize-winning novel can be assured that Austin screenwriter Bill Witalf has transformed it into a film that enlightens rather than obscures the heart of it.

For viewers who haven't read the novel, the movie stands on its own. It's proof that the miniseries is still a worthwhile genre for epics like "Lonesome Dove" that can't be contained in a two-hour film.

The cast is virtually unprecedented for a network movie — Oscar winners Robert Duvall ("Tender Mercies") and Anjelica Huston ("Prizzi's Honor"), plus Tommy Lee Jones, Diane Lane, D.B. Sweeney, Frederic Forrest, Robert Ulrich, Rickie Schroder, Chris Cooper, Glenn Hendly and William Sanderson.

Witalf wrote "Itaged Man" and "Country" and co-wrote "The Black Stallion." Director Simon Wincer's credits include "Phar Lap" and the network miniseries "Bluegrass."

But the miniseries belongs to Duvall. Well, the book did belong to Gus McCrae. Duvall, an actor who becomes his role, has found in co-philosopher Gus a character who becomes the actor just as much.

Jones (with his hair dyed white) holds his own with Duvall, no mean feat. He has perhaps a more difficult role, as the simmering, taciturn Call.

Gus and Call are legendary Texas Rangers reduced to running a down-at-the-heels cattle outfit along the Rio Grande, just outside a wide spot in the road called Lonesome Dove.

When old companion Jake Spoon (Ulrich) shows up after 10 years, running from a fatal misunderstanding in Arkansas, he's full of tales of a cattleman's paradise in a wilderness called Montana.

Call, without Indians and outlaws to keep his mind off the ghosts of his past, figures an adventure is just what he needs, and he's soon

rounded up 2,600 head of Mexican cattle and an inexperienced bunch of hands and headed off on a 3,000-mile trail drive.

Gus is usually satisfied to sit on the porch avoiding work, sipping whiskey and expounding loudly on any subject that happens to come up. But he goes along hoping to see his true love, Clara (Huston), who is married to a horse trader in Nebraska. Jake trails along with Lorie (Lane), a young prostitute who believes his promise to take her to San Francisco.

Meanwhile, Arkansas sheriff July Johnson (Cooper) embarks reluctantly on a mission to bring Jake to justice. He is soon distracted, though, by the news that his wife (Hendly) has run off. She, too, is

bound for Nebraska, and an outlaw she still loves.

Along the way, the cowboys tangle with ~~bandits~~, stampedes, horse thieves and Indians. Lorie is stolen by Blue Duck (Forrest), a vicious renegade who duels with Gus and meets an unusual demise.

Witalf did an exceptional job of turning McMurtry's vivid but often introspective 840-page book into a film, preserving the dialogue and improving the ending by a simple rearrangement of minor events.

Much of the violence and raunchiness of the book remains, though toned down for network TV. When Gus is under attack by Indians on the open plains, he stabs his horse to death to use him for cover.

Wincer occasionally lapses into unnecessary slow-melodrama. But only occasionally. The action sequences are mostly superb.

Set designer Cary White has turned the "Lonesome Dove" of imagination into a reality. And Douglas Milson's cinematography is evocative without being too darned purty.

Witalf telescopes many events, so the miniseries gets going much more quickly than the book. By the end of the first night, the trail drive is under way and the first fatality has occurred at the Nuceses River. By then, any viewer with a pulse should be hooked.

In exchange for the quicker pace, the miniseries shucks some of the character development of the book. There's no way around that unless the network stretched the miniseries into a week. After four nights, viewers might wish that they had.

All are closed-captioned for the hearing-impaired, and except for the Shirley Temple movies (\$19.98), are priced at \$14.98.

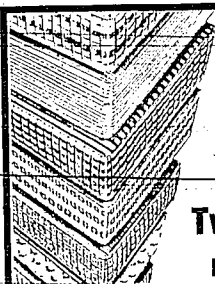

Tough 'Wonder Years' shift

LOS ANGELES — The "Wonder Years," the poignant comedy about coming-of-age in 1968, was a stunning achievement when it appeared on ABC last spring, first because its six episodes were so good, and then because, after only six episodes, it was awarded the Emmy for best comedy.

For the creators of "The Wonder Years," the husband-wife team of Neal Marlens and Carol Black, the transition from virtually handcrafting six episodes to the assembly line of turning out an episode a week has been tough, especially complicated by the writers' strike, which delayed their hiring a writing staff for a show that demands a special touch and then forcing that staff to get right to work.

"Things have been coming out pretty smoothly," Black told a recent press conference here. "But as

you get this far into the season, you always do start getting down to a crunch."

"We're actually on a schedule where we're essentially about done with a script on the day we start shooting it," Marlens said. "And we do our final sound mix the day before we air the show. So, we'll deliver it to the network essentially the morning that it airs. That's how much leeway we have right now."

"It's just a lot of hard work," Black said. "You really keep trying to maintain the quality and we hope to be able to, but, you know, it's a battle."

One thing that makes "The Wonder Years," which runs Wednesday nights on ABC, such a difficult show to do is an aspect that adds to its uniqueness — the character who has the most to say is an unseen narrator. It is the voice of the main character Kevin Arnold, a 12-year-old boy in 1968, but grown up 20

years later.

"The post-production is a lot more complicated than in most shows because we're cutting the narration against the picture, which is actually rather complicated technically," Black said.

That narrator's voice belongs to Daniel Stern, who came to prominence as an actor in "Breaking Away" and "Diner." Marlene and Black picked Stern's voice from a batch of tryout tapes that were submitted.

"Some people approach the narration by narrating it," Black said. "Danny approached it as an actor by really acting."

"We were really looking for someone who seemed like they were sort of sitting with a bunch of friends, telling a story," Marlene said. "We just have a sense that this is a guy who's sitting in a bar somewhere drinking draft Bud and telling stories about when he was growing up in a suburban community."

"The words just seem to flow pretty easily," Stern said of his work. "It's a pretty well-developed character, considering it's just a voice."

"We're really on the same wave-

length," Black said of Stern. "When we write a line in a certain way, he gets it."

The use of a narrator makes an interesting challenge for the 12-year-old Fred Savage, who plays 12-year-old Kevin Arnold. Much of his acting consists of providing the proper facial expressions while Stern's narration tells what is going on in his head.

"It's not really hard," Savage said. "When he does the narration, it's like me talking, I'm talking, but I'm not moving my lips, but I'm still having the same face reactions."

Savage said that he has no problem identifying with Kevin, though his character faced being 12-years-old two decades ago.

"I think what I'm going through and what the boy in the '60s is going through is the same thing, to be totally honest," he said. "You know, he's worried about girls and school and whether his hair is right and stuff like that. I think it's very similar."

"We are 20 years apart. So, if I were to go inside and play video games, he would go outside and play football on the street or something. That'd be a difference, what's been invented since then. But, I think we're pretty much the same."
