## Bush address covers foreign, domestic goals

WASHINGTON — President Bush, charting a course for his new administration, proposed more money for domestic programs and restraint of the Pentagon budget Thursday night as he summoned the Democratic Congress to work with him to "ensure a better tomorrow."

In a well-received, 50-minute address to a joint session of Congress, the president vowed to proceed with caution in his dealings with Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev. Still, he added, "We will not miss any opportunity to work for peace."

Bush devoted most of his speech to domestic issues, though, as he sketched the outlines of a \$1.16 trillion budget. He called for \$2.6 billion in reductions from President Reagan's Pentagon spending plan and modest increases in selected domestic programs such as education and the environment.

He repeated his longstanding vow of no new taxes.

Less than one month on the job, the new president echoed the campaign of 1988 with his declaration that he wants to be an education president, wants the death penalty for drug kingpins and favors a cut in the capital gains tax.

He made a notable bow to the environmentalists with a call to suspend three oil leases; and another to the anti-abortionists with his call for an increased tax break for parents who adopted a child.

He called for a society "free from discrimination and bigotry" and threw a bouquet in the direction of

Democrat Jesse Jackson when he said — as Jackson did to kids in the inner cities — "Keep hope alive."

Above all, he summoned the Democratic Congress to join with him "in solving the deficit problem. 'The people didn't send us here to bicker,' said the new president. 'It's time to govern.'

Bush also voiced his personal support for making Puerto Rico the nation's 51st state and called on Congress to take the necessary steps to let the people decide in a referendum.

And he said he would set up a new Task Force on Competitiveness, chaired by Vice President Dan Quayle. Saying, "The most important competitiveness program of all is one that improves education in America," he traced a number of schooling initiatives.

The Bush speech was not a State of the Union address — but it stood for one, touching upon key foreign policy issues as well as a wide range of domestic concerns.

"I don't propose to reverse direction," he said. "We are headed the right way." Nonetheless, he signaled a string of initiatives that signaled an end to some of the restraints set by the Reagan administration.

Bush received a standing ovation when he entered the House chamber, packed with members of the heavily Democratic Congress, the Supreme Court, his Cabinet and staff and guests. Mrs. Bush joined in the applause from her seat in the gallery.

The president's budget plan, which features a one-year freeze on

## Cancer treatment center future uncertain after court hearing

TWIN FALLS — The future of a \$5 million cancer treatment center project is uncertain after an all-day court hearing Thursday.

After hearing testimony for and against \$12 million in additional county hospital spending, Fifth District Judge Daniel Hurlbutt took the proposed budget amendment under advisement. He will study the issue and write an opinion later.

Hinging on Hurlbutt's decision are the

comprehensive cancer treatment center, a magnetic resonance imaging system, a contemplated land purchase, a computer system and other equipment purchases. Without the amendment, the hospital would have to put those projects on hold until its next budget year begins in the fall.

Hurlbutt's decision could be appealed. Citing state laws, opponents of the amendment contended the court lacks jurisdiction over the issue and that by going to court, Magic Valley Regional Medical Center officials are circumventing a law requiring pub-

lic budget hearings.

"What we're concerned about is, what are they going to try to get past us next?" asked Rudy Barchas, lawyer for Gary Thietten, whose Idaho Home Health and Hospice competes with the hospital. "What if MVRMC wanted to open an abortion clinic?"

He contended the hospital could exclude such a project from its normal budget and then go to court for approval a few months later — giving the public no chance to comment on the hypothetical clinic.

"If this is the right way to be doing this,

then the whole process is a farce," Barchas said.

Hospital officials argued that state law calls for routing any county budget amendment through District Court, as they have done. And they said the cancer center shouldn't wait till next year.

"I don't think this is a life and death emergency, but it is urgent that we complete it on time," said Dr. Ben Katz, Hospital Board chairman. "Any delay in doing so is detrimental to the community."

The hospital began pursuing the budget

amendment last month after Thietten and other citizens objected to the hospital's plans to finance expansion projects with previously unpublicized reserve funds. Officials discovered that the hospital's plans would put the institution well over its budgeted limit for capital spending.

The hospital opened its seven-witness presentation Thursday with testimony from Fred Mathews, the hospital's controller; John Bingham, hospital administrator; and Ken Fry, assistant administrator in charge

## WIPP bill won't ease Gem waste embargo

TWIN FALLS — Though encouraged by legislative action that would open a permanent waste repository, Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus says the state's borders will stay closed for now.

Reps. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, and Joe Skeen, R-N.M., introduced legislation Thursday that would authorize the transfer of more than 10,000 acres of federal lands in southern New Mexico to Energy Department jurisdiction.

As I have indicated in the past, action on the legislative land withdrawal issue was a precondition to any willingness on my part to re-evaluate

the state of Idaho's position concerning waste storage. I can say today no reassessment of the ban on waste shipments will occur until I sit down and discuss all the issues with (Energy Department) officials. The state's borders remain closed," Andrus said Thursday in a prepared statement.

The legislation moves the nation's first permanent nuclear waste repository closer to reality. The bill was designed in part to avert the forced shutdown of a Colorado plant that produces plutonium triggers for nuclear bombs.

The repository, mined from salt beds deep beneath the New Mexico desert, was to open in October 1988. Water leaks, problems with a waste transportation cask and other safety concerns de-

layed the opening. The Energy Department has not set a new date for opening the site.

The delay in opening the repository has caused a major problem for the States of Idaho and Colorado, Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus late last year barred the shipment of wastes from Colorado's Rocky Flats plutonium processing plant to the temporary storage site at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

Colorado, in turn, has said it will close the Rocky Flats plant in May unless a new waste storage site is found for the contaminated materials that are building up at Rocky Flats just outside Denver.

## Bone-deep chill stays with Idaho

No more blizzards were in the picture, but forecasters also saw no real end in sight Thursday to more than a week of bone-chilling cold that has wreaked havoc on Idaho livestock and wildlife.

The state's low temperature early Thursday was 97 degrees below zero on the Camus Prairie at Fairfield. And although Wednesday saw the first temperatures above freezing recorded anywhere in Idaho in nearly a week, most of the snow remained in a smoky deep freeze.

"We're not looking for too much improvement, just a few degrees really," said Clifford Collins, a National Weather Service forecaster in Boise. "With this cloud cover we might have a few lows a little above zero, but not many."

The Panhandle and most of eastern Idaho was beneath fairly clear skies Thursday, but an inversion continued to trap cold, dry air near the surface of southern Idaho.

Many stockmen continued struggling to get hay to stranded animals near the surface of southern Idaho.

## 'New class' sabotaging Gorbachev reforms

MOSCOW — A "new class" of Communist Party and government bureaucrats is sabotaging President Mikhail S. Gorbachev's reforms, and the Soviet leadership is unable to combat it, a daring magazine article says.

Direct criticism of Gorbachev's reform program has remained largely off limits, despite the publication of greater openness in the Soviet Union. But Sergei Y. Andreyev's article in the Leningrad monthly Novy Izvestiye, one of the hardest and most detailed attacks yet on the communist system, and Gorbachev's policies.

The party general secretary — the post Gorbachev holds along with the presidency — remains "an inaccessible and exemplary figure" and his attempt to make the system democratic still leaves the people politically powerless, Andreyev wrote.

All decisions of the upper powers are carried out only to the extent that they are advantageous to the new class," Andreyev said in the 28-page article in the January issue of the literary and political magazine.

Gorbachev himself has launched a war on bureaucrats who interfere in day-to-day decisions about production and has tried to transfer some of their power to local officials and factory managers. He often blames bureaucrats for the slow pace of reform.

But Andreyev said Gorbachev hasn't gone far enough and that the new elites control the government and party.

Both the Soviet government and party organs have turned out to be subservient to its interests," he said, adding that the model government of the people has been replaced by the "dictate of the new class."

# Tower nomination still in limbo

WASHINGTON — Democrats said Thursday that Defense Secretary designate John Tower's nomination will rise or fall on the answers to outstanding questions, but Republicans rallied to his side, one complaining of a "feeding frenzy" of allegations.

Sen. Sam Nunn, the Armed Services Committee chairman who has said he would formally oppose the nomination if a vote were held now, said he'd be ready to work with Tower if the confirmation goes through.

Other questions involve Tower's uses of federal programs, calls for roughly \$5 billion more spending than the budget submitted by Reagan last month and carries out Bush's oft-stated vow of not seeking any increase in taxes.

The two bills — one stringent, the other more lenient — represent the two edges of the debate, Stallings said.

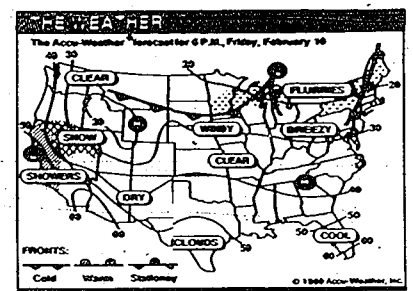
Other items that still must be completed before the repository can open include an air intake, verification that all work underground has been completed, completion of safety analysis, review by the National Academy of Science and "a lot of paper work and a lot of tests still to run," Stallings said.

The (Energy Department) is the biggest holdup, Stallings said. The legislation could be done as early as late summer, but the repository would not be ready until early fall if the department gets their act together, he said.

**Armed teen takes girl hostage**

RIGBY (AP) — A 14-year-old Rigby Junior High School student remained in custody Thursday after threatening his teacher and two classmates at a gunpoint, then taking a 14-year-old female student hostage.

Jefferson County Sheriff Blair Olsen said the boy, armed with a .22-caliber revolver, took the girl from class at 10:54 a.m. Wednesday and went to the nearby Rigby Stake Center of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

"The gun was loaded, the hammer

was cocked, and his finger was on the trigger," Olsen said.

Rigby Police officers and sheriff's deputies surrounded the building and apprehended the boy at 11:54 a.m. with no shots fired.

"We had to physically take the suspect down," Rigby Police Chief Larry Anderson said. There were no injuries.

The boy, whose identity was not released, was being held in the Fremont County Juvenile Detention Center in St. Anthony on Thursday.

At a detention hearing, Magistrate Michael Kennedy ruled that the boy would remain in custody. Juveniles are not eligible for bail.

Anderson said the youth faces charges of kidnapping, aggravated assault with a deadly weapon and aggravated assault on a police officer.

Jefferson County School Superintendent Elwood Wilson said the situation could have been avoided if the boy's classmates had told school officials what they knew about his plans.

**Pilot crashes while training to dust crops**

COTTONWOOD (AP) — A pilot making a practice flight apparently miscalculated his altitude over a snow-covered barley field and crashed his single-engine plane.

Jerome Fox of Cottonwood was uninjured in the Wednesday afternoon crash, but the plane was destroyed.

Idaho County Sheriff's Deputy Bill Oliver said Fox, who was training as a cropdusting pilot, was flying over his own field about two miles south of Cottonwood.

**Investment tax credit bill dies**

BOISE (AP) — The first bill this legislative session dealing with Idaho's investment tax credit has gone down to defeat in a House committee.

The House Revenue and Taxation Committee voted 11-7 Thursday to hold indefinitely a bill sponsored by Rep. Myron Jones, R-Malad, to expand the 3 percent credit to 5 percent.

Jones estimated that would drain

\$4 million from state tax revenue, but he contended it could stimulate business activity to the point there was no actual loss. However, admin-

istration budget experts said the bill actually could cost up to \$10 million per year in lost tax revenue.

Rep. Michael Simpson, R-Blackfoot, who said he favors the investment credit, said he hoped defeat of the bill would be a different reason. Simpson warned committee members that if the bill were sent to the House floor for a vote, anything could happen to it.



**Lottery laws undergo scrutiny**

BOISE (AP) — State legislators say they want to take a look at the rules and regulations which will be used to run the state lottery.

The House State Affairs Committee on Thursday voted to print and introduce a 13-page bill making mostly technical changes in state laws to run the lottery.

But many of the laws refer to rules and regulations, and Deputy Attorney General Pat Kole said the Lottery Commission still is drafting them.

When committee members said they wanted to see the rules before they went into effect, Kole said he would provide the latest draft available no later than Friday.

Lottery officials said earlier they expected to get the lottery in operation later this year. It was approved by voters in the November general election. A report given to the Legislature this week estimated the state's sales at \$25 million, the state profit at more than \$6 million and prize money at more than \$11 mil-

lion.

Kole said the bill approved for introduction Thursday makes it clear that money to run the lottery will come from gross revenue and not be subject to legislative appropriation.

Lottery fiscal officer Steve Woodall said that's because the number of tickets and other supplies the lottery will purchase will depend on revenue. The lottery will make quarterly and annual reports, but it would be awkward to wait for the Legislature to approve before making purchases.

### Jagers sentencing rejects retribution

There were, to be sure, the inevitable demands from the prosecuting attorney to lock Jesse Ray Jagers up for life and throw away the key.

And those demands were echoed by close friends and neighbors of Jagers' victim, Virginia Westergren, whose peaceful neighborhood has been damaged by what was clearly a hideous and awful event.

But despite those calls for a longer or lifetime sentence without parole, we think Fifth District Judge Daniel Meehl came pretty close to the mark in his decision to send the 18-year-old Jagers to prison for a minimum of 25 years.

Yes, the judge could have fixed a longer sentence. Indeed, a 30-year or 40-year fixed term would not have seemed excessive, considering the offense.

But Meehl was correct, in our view, in not fixing the term at life. There are several reasons for this.

First, Meehl was careful to qualify his sentence of Jagers with the strong recommendation that the young man be given mental health treatment and not be granted parole unless he is shown to be mentally stable. Without such a showing, Jagers will remain in prison, even if it is beyond 25 years.

This condition is a reasonable one which counters the prosecutor's rhetoric that anything less than a life sentence endangers the community.

Second, a life sentence would likely be overturned on appeal. A shorter fixed sentence of the type Meehl gave is likely to stand, but it throw-the-book-at-him approach would not.

The reason for this is the third reason Meehl's sentence makes sense: a punishment must not be disproportionate to the offense.

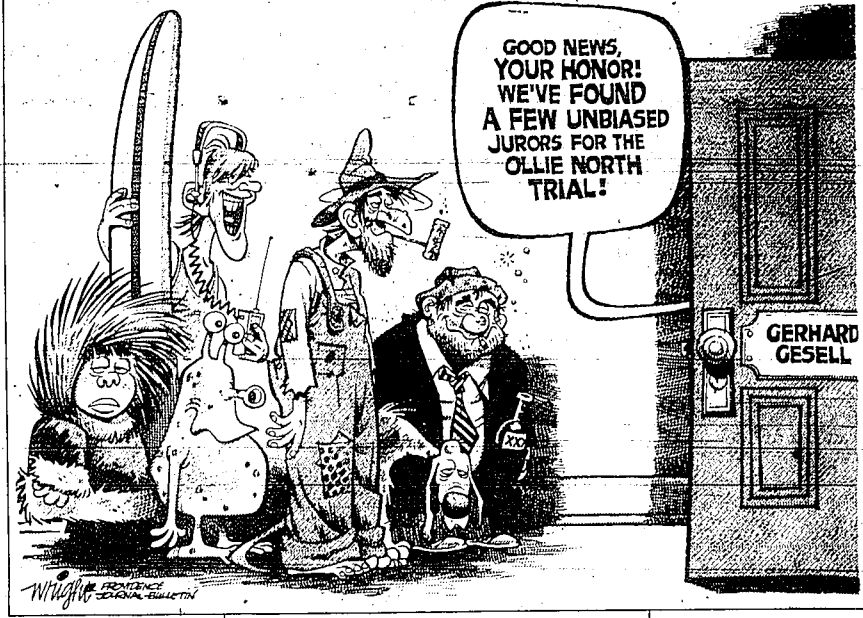
In the Jagers case, Meehl had to weigh a number of factors, including the age and troubled history of the defendant, the possibility of treatment in the future, the likelihood of that treatment under extensive incarceration, and the prevention of further crimes by the defendant.

All of these may, to some degree, mitigate the legitimate punitive value which a sentence carries.

No one, especially Judge Meehl, wants Jagers to return to the society and commit another crime. No one wants the death of another Virginia Westergren.

But unless we are to become the eye-for-an-eye, life-for-life society that our prosecutors seem to want, we should continue to give to judges the authority to weigh all such factors.

That, not retribution, is the essence of justice.



### Porn played part in Bundy's crimes

It is tempting to do our best to forget Ted Bundy, but this man and the lessons that his life offers must not be forgotten.

Bundy roamed the country on a 20-year trail of premeditated, sadistic violence — a trail marked by rape, mutilation and murder. In a chilling final interview before his execution, he discussed at length some of the formative influences in his destructive life. The role of alcohol abuse is not surprising, but the role of hard-core pornography in his life sheds new light.

Bundy documented his early exposure to hard-core pornography, saying that the material had a "crystallizing effect" on his violent tendencies and his eventual acting out of the fantasies he had seen depicted for so long. Bundy referred to hard-core pornography as the fuel for his fantasies.

We could dismiss these conclusions as the 11-hour ramblings of a psychopathic murderer if the evidence supporting them were not so strong. Most Americans are unaware of a 1988 study by the FBI of 36 other serial murderers. According to the final report of the 1986 Attorney General's Commission on Pornography, 81 percent of those studied "said their biggest sexual interest was in reading pornography." The words of Arthur Bishop, executed in June

for having sodomized and murdered five boys (ages 4 to 13) in Utah, are particularly illustrative: "Pornography wasn't the only negative influence in my life, but its effect on me was devastating. I lost all sense of decency and respect for humanity and life, and I would do anything or take any risk to fulfill my deviant desires."

Like Bundy, Bishop went on to describe his progress in the use and abuse of pornography. Starting with addiction to common pornography, he escalated to a need for more violent, degrading material and to an increased propensity to act out fantasies portrayed in such material.

For those who have seen today's hard-core pornography, the progression is not surprising. The range of degradation includes the explicit depiction of simulated and real rape, whipping, bondage, torture, urination and bestiality (sex with animals). The material is a far, far cry from the airbrushed centerfolds of 20 years ago.

When one sees the true content of the hard-core, it is not difficult to believe that, as many researchers and studies have confirmed, it has contributed to the rise in the abuse and degradation

of women. Ted Bundy, like so many who have gone unnoticed before him, reminds us that the time has come to stand together in opposing pornography. In most states, laws are already on the books to prosecute this material.

The Supreme Court has declared unequivocally that obscenity is not a protected form of speech. Yet hard-core pornography remains readily available on the shelves of adult bookstores and so-called "family" video outlets.

So what lesson can we learn from the death of a serial killer? That we no longer can remain ambivalent. Each of us must stand up and let our local, state and federal officials know that hard-core pornography destroys lives and must be stopped.

The world of hard-core has already produced enough victims. How many more Bundys or Bishops must tell us of pornography's destructive role? How many more studies must be completed? How many more lives must be lost before we say enough? It is time that the charade of hard-core pornography's innocence ended.

## Bundy's last words constitute manipulation, deceit

When Ted Bundy ended his last jailhouse interview just hours before he went to Florida's electric chair for the crime of murder, he left a different kind of carnage behind. Truth was massacred, logic was crumpled and maimed; the ground was littered with tautologies and half-truths.

His partners in this, the last crime that he was able to commit, were the media, for the loving and devoted credence that they lent to his claims, and James Dobson of the Los Angeles religious broadcast "Focus on the Family." Bundy lied all the way through his dramatic last interview, and the media didn't call him on it, and Dobson actually fostered those lies.

Dobson is a former member of the so-called Meese commission, the pro-censorship task force assembled by our now-disgraced former attorney general. If anyone has anything bad to say about adult-oriented material, Dobson is there to hear it and add his hearty endorsement.

Bundy had plenty had to say about sex and violence in the media. In fact, he blamed the

Al Goldstein media for his crimes. But if we are to remain a nation guided by reason and not by such jailhouse histrionics, we must formulate an answer to Bundy and, more important, to Dobson.

Let us begin at the beginning, and focus on the family, as Dobson and Bundy did. Their argument was artfully conceived. They portrayed Ted as a young boy from a perfectly fine home who was corrupted by the influence of pornography.

That "fine solid Christian home" (as Bundy put it) deserves a closer look, because if allowed Dobson to extrapolate the dangers to his own constituency. "Pornography can reach out and snatch a kid from any house today" is how master manipulator Bundy put it in the interview.

But was Ted Bundy's early life average or normal? Was Ted's home "fine" or "horrible"? He was an illegitimate child, and the grandfather who raised him was a violent man who

vented his aggressions against people and animals both.

At 4, Ted was removed from his grandparents' house by his mother, who took him to Seattle, where she later married a man who was sending roundhouse rights in Ted's direction. If that is the "solid Christian home" that Dobson is intent on presenting, we are all in trouble.

Dobson didn't call the killer on his rather obvious lie (although all the facts are available in the numerous books on Bundy). But what was Bundy's reason for twisting the truth?

The man whom Dobson asked us to believe was, of course, a pathological liar. But he had a reason for that particular lie, and he stated it: "I hope nobody will try to take the easy way out and try to blame or otherwise accuse my family of contributing to his crimes."

Don't worry, Ted, the media will swallow your easy way out — pornography made me do it — look, line and sinker.

The facts about violence and pornography clearly point away from the conclusion that

Dobson wants to draw from the monstrous case of Ted Bundy.

Adult entertainment is such an easy target since many of its users are too timid or guilt-ridden to defend it. The implicit message of the Dobson-Bundy interview is, in fact, we should censor adult material.

But censorship, once embarked on, has a way of growing out of control. Look to Iran, or the Soviet Union, to see about that.

Does porn cause violence? Clearly, no. In laboratory settings, viewing non-violent sexually explicit material actually reduces aggressive tendencies. That suggests that nonviolent pornography can help reduce the rate of rape. In fact, that is exactly what happened when Denmark legalized pornography. Rape rates went down, and then stabilized at a lower level.

But that is "nonviolent" sexual material. Isn't all pornography getting more violent, as Dobson suggests?

The Meese commission itself did a study of the top dozen "men's sophisticated" magazines. The study concluded that there was a negligi-

ble violent content in those mainstream magazines — only 0.6 percent of the total imagery.

Yet Dobson repeatedly touts Playboy, Penthouse and soft-core material with the same brush that he uses for "slasher" movies. In fact, in the interview Bundy himself did not refer to pornography without the qualifier "violent."

Predictably, Dobson is offering the Bundy interview on videotape as a fund-raising vehicle for his "Focus on the Family." It is a slick and cynical effort to inflame the censorship debate in America. The Big Lie of Dobson's argument is concealed, Goebbels-style, within his rant: If you read Playboy or Penthouse, you will turn into Ted Bundy.

Does this make any sense to anyone outside the puritanical precincts of Dobsonland?

It is fortunate for us all that the lies and killings of Ted Bundy have stopped forever. James Dobson's assault against the truth continues, however.

## Federal appeals court gives North trial green-light to proceed

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal appeals court on Thursday denied a Justice Department attempt to stop Oliver North's Iran-Contra trial on national security grounds.

The court agreed with the trial judge that the department lacked authority to intervene.

The ruling came after U.S. District Judge Gerhard A. Gesell had sent the newly picked jury home for the weekend.

The Justice Department had insisted that "highly classified material" might be compromised under pre-trial rules set by Gesell.

In a two-sentence order, the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals dissolved its temporary stay of the proceedings, saying it was denying the department's motion to stop the trial "substantially for the reasons given" by Gesell. He had ruled that the attorney general did not have authority to intervene in the prosecution, which is being handled by independent counsel Lawrence Walsh.

Two hours earlier, not having heard from the appeals court, Gesell had sent the jury home, saying he had to "close up shop" until Monday because of the government appeal.

He told the jury of nine women and three men that "there is good news and bad news. The good news is we are going to shut down until Monday at 9:30 a.m."

To the extent there is bad news, by reason of filings of papers the Court of Appeals has asked me not to go forward until they have had a chance to look at them."

"What we are going to do is shut down, catch up on our sleep," he said.

The Justice Department had appealed a Gesell ruling that department officials could not routinely censor classified information before it was presented in court.

Earlier Thursday, the jury was selected, with lawyers from each side eliminating prospective jurors from a panel of 45 without stating a reason. All of the people on the panel had said in open court they had read, heard or seen little or nothing of North's testimony before two congressional committees in the summer of 1987.

Nine of the 12 criminal charges lodged against North focus on accusations that he concealed from Congress and former Attorney General Edwin Meese III his efforts on behalf of the Contras fighting the leftist government of Nicaragua.

Gesell said he will not swear in the jury until he hears from the appeals court. The rule of double jeopardy, which protects North from being tried twice on the same charges, comes into play once a jury is sworn.

## Libya chemical arms capability exceeds its need, CIA chief says

WASHINGTON (AP) — CIA Director William Webster told Congress on Thursday that Libya has acquired chemical weapons production capabilities far in excess of its own military needs, posing the possibility such weapons could be transferred to Middle East nations with past links to terrorists.

Testifying before the Senate Governmental Affairs Committee, Webster also said that in recent years "the moral barrier to biological warfare has been breached," with at least 10 countries now working to produce both previously known and futuristic biological weapons.

Webster said Libya has experi-

enced "at least one serious toxic chemical spill" at production facilities at an isolated site near Rubi, some 60 miles southwest of Tripoli.

He said that while such problems are expected to continue, the Libyan plant should be ready soon to order large-scale production of mustard gas and nerve agents, potentially at a rate of "tens of tons per day."

Webster said the Libyan facility is the largest single factory complex in the Third World capable of producing chemical weapons, although he said Iraq's overall chemical weapons potential is thought to be larger still.

"We are concerned that the plant's

production capabilities far, far exceed what Libya could use for its own military purposes," Webster said.

Webster said the Libyan chemical complex is linked to a nearby metal fabrication facility "equipped with the precision materials to manufacture components for a variety of bombs and artillery."

"Other facilities are involved with filling and storing chemical weapons," he said.

Repeating previous U.S. assertions, Webster said West German companies have given Libya extensive assistance to assemble the chemical complex and provide material for it.

## Human error delays 450,000 returns

WASHINGTON (AP) — A human error in running a computer has delayed 450,000 federal tax refunds by a week, but the IRS said Thursday there is no comparison with the computer problems that made a disaster of the 1985 filing season.

"The situation was uncovered immediately and remedial steps were taken so that no taxpayers were inconvenienced," IRS spokesman Frank Keith said of the latest problem.

"People are going to get their refund checks in the four-to-six-week time frame that is typical at this time of the year," said Ellen

Murphy, IRS director of public affairs. But checks for those who filed in the second or third week of January will be mailed Feb. 17, rather than Feb. 10 as had been planned.

Millions of tax refunds were delayed for several weeks in 1985 because of problems with a new \$103 million computer system. Keith was asked whether taxpayers should be worried that the new problem might be the first warning of a recurrence. "Absolutely not," he said.

"This year, he said, there was no problem with the computer itself or the instructions fed into it.

"We learned from the 1985

problems and we wanted to make sure that whatever was needed to be done was done... that no taxpayer would receive an erroneous notice," Keith said.

The IRS deliberately delayed mailing the 450,000 refund checks, as well as any tax-due notices arising from returns filed early this year, until the human error could be corrected.

"That error was made at the IRS computing center in Martinsburg, W. Va.

## ABA adopts guardianship overhaul plan

DENVER (AP) — The American Bar Association has adopted a plan to overhaul the nation's guardianship system for the elderly by tightening judicial procedures, requiring more accountability and educating judges and guardians.

The ABA's House of Delegates, on a voice vote Tuesday, approved the reforms drafted by guardianship experts last summer in response to an Associated Press series, said Nancy Coleman, director of the ABA's Commission on Legal Problems of the Elderly.

The AP report found widespread abuse through guardianship, the court-administered system designed to protect the elderly.

Ms. Coleman said that the ABA policy will be used to help states draft guardianship reforms as well as generate education requirements.

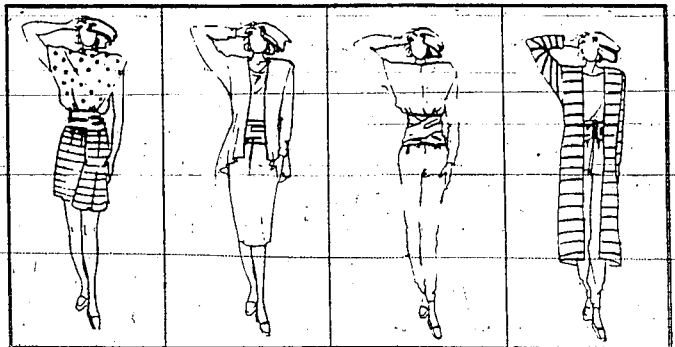

# State Department plans more immigration

WASHINGTON (AP) — The State Department announced Thursday that 10,000 extra visas will be issued in both 1990 and 1991 to immigrants from 162 countries on a random basis.

Eligible for the lottery are citizens of the Soviet Union, Poland and several other countries whose refugee quotas are filled. The application period is March 1 through March 31. Unlike the last such lottery in 1986, the visas will not be issued on a first-come, first-served basis.

Instead, the applications will be fed to computers and the selections made on a random basis. Immigrants from all the eligible countries will have an equal chance.

Unlike refugees, who are generally given haven for political reasons, immigrants are required to have close relatives in the United States or have a scarce profession. However, the 20,000 to be admitted under the special program will not have to meet those requirements.

Only screening for mental or crimi-

nal liabilities will be conducted, U.S. officials said.

The only countries excluded are those that used fewer than 5,000 immigrant slots in fiscal 1988. These are China, Colombia, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guyana, Haiti, India, Jamaica, South Korea, Mexico, the Philippines and the United Kingdom.

The excluded include Taiwan and also natives of Anguilla, Bermuda, British Virgin Islands, Cayman Islands, Falkland Islands, Gibraltar, Hong Kong, Montserrat, Pitcairn, St. Helena, Turks and Caicos Islands.

A lottery for 10,000 visas was held in 1986. About 1.4 million applicants lost out.

The State Department announcement contained strict rules for applicants. Among them is that all applications must be typewritten and that husbands and wives may apply separately.

Last month, in a move to admit more Soviet and East European refugees, former President Reagan

decided to increase this fiscal year's quota by 7,000 by lowering the quota of Vietnamese refugees, many of whom are former political prisoners.

The decision brought to 25,600 the number of Soviets who will be permitted to enter the United States. While the added slots will be taken mostly from the quota for refugees from Vietnam, U.S. officials stressed the president has considerable flexibility to alter the totals later on.

Thousands of Soviet refugees, many of them Jews, are in Vienna and Rome, waiting for permission to come to the United States, and the quota for them to enter this country is full.

The lottery announced Thursday will give them a chance to enter the country as immigrants — but the chance will be no greater than that of applicants from the 161 other countries that are eligible.

## Police shooting draws community anger

BOSTON (AP) — Less than four years ago, Donald Johnson was cited for heroism after he rescued a family from a fire. Last week, police fatally shot the teen-ager after he took a Greyhound bus for a joy ride.

Police maintain they shot at the bus, killing Johnson, because he was endangering the lives of others by refusing to stop driving erratically through a Boston neighborhood late at night. And city officials, in preliminary findings, say the shooting was justified.

But his mother, Betty Johnson, a longtime community activist, and other black leaders claim that police overreacted, shooting someone who was unarmed and had no criminal background.

"This means a black kid's life in Boston doesn't mean very much," said the Rev. Graylan Ellis-Hogler, a minister in the mostly

black neighborhood of Roxbury. "Police don't hesitate to use deadly force against kids of color."

Mrs. Johnson, 48, is unable to explain why her son, a junior in high school who turned 19 the day before he died, took the bus on Jan. 31.

She was further embittered by the fact that she was not notified by police about her son's death, learning it instead from a newspaper. She remembers her son as a "boy with a heart of gold," a Boy Scout who worked with her on community projects and was active in youth anti-drug work.

"Donald wasn't on drugs... He wasn't a drinker," said Mrs. Johnson. "I'm not saying he wasn't wrong in what he did. I'm saying he wasn't out to hurt anybody. If police had given him half a chance, he would have come home to me in the bus..."

## Naming of female bishop gets worldwide attention

BOSTON (AP) — The Episcopal Church is mustering full power and ceremony to install Barbara Harris as the first woman bishop in a 2,000-year Christian line dating to the apostles.

The worldwide attention expected for Saturday's events goes far beyond anything the Episcopal Church usually confronts and reflects a debate that has simmered within church ranks and now threatens to spill over into Christianity at large.

Some 8,000 tickets have already been distributed for the consecration. Demand has forced church officials to move the ceremony from St. Paul's Cathedral in Boston to the cavernous Hynes Convention Center, which has room for spectators, a chorus of 130, television cameras and a large contingent of journalists.

Though no one is announcing any last-minute effort to block the appointment, a good many of the attendees can be expected to hold their breath when the ritual requires presiding Bishop Edmund Browning to intone: "If any of you know any reason why we should not proceed, let it now be made known."

The 58-year-old former head of a left-wing religious publishing company has been a subject of some controversy within the church since Sept. 24 when the Episcopal Diocese of Boston elected her suffragan, or assistant bishop.

Women have been priests in the Episcopal Church since 1976. But be-

coming an bishop is a question of much higher magnitude. Harris would become the first woman to reach that height in any of the three major branches of Christianity — Roman Catholicism, Eastern Orthodox and Anglicanism — that trace bishops in a direct line back to the Apostles of Jesus.

After the election last September, debate ensued across the country among 418 church committees responsible for confirming the election.

A traditionalist faction of the Episcopal Church, led by the Evangelical and Catholic Mission in Austin, Texas, rallied in opposition to Harris' elevation. Now, prelates and observers on both sides of the issue are concerned that the stakes may be even larger than the unity of the Episcopal Church, which is a branch of worldwide Anglicanism.

The Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox and Anglican churches have been in discussions for easing their centuries-old differences. And they have made great progress, said James Sulheim, a spokesman for the Boston Episcopal diocese. "For Roman Catholics, the idea of a woman standing at the altar representing Christ is totally unacceptable."

## Stroke drug may help old brains

WASHINGTON (AP) — A drug approved for some stroke patients may also reinvigorate sluggish, aging brains with the quick-witted learning ability of youth, a group of Chicago researchers reported Thursday.

In tests on groups of young and middle-aged rabbits at Northwestern University Medical School, researchers said that a drug called nimodipine was able to correct age-related mental slowness so that the older rabbits could learn as well as the younger ones.

"They (older rabbits receiving the drug) actually learned at the same rate, if not a slightly faster than the young rabbits," said John F. Distenhof, an associate professor of cell biology at Northwestern, who directed the study. "Two-thirds of the control group (older rabbits not receiving the drug) never did learn the task."

He said that although the experiment used only a laboratory test of learning, there is "every reason to believe" that the results would also apply to human learning skills.

The Northwestern experiment, reported in Friday's edition of the journal Science, was conducted using four groups of rabbits. Two of the groups were about 30 months old, about middle age for rabbits. The other two groups were young adult rabbits.

Nimodipine was administered to one of the older groups and to one of the younger groups. The others were kept free of the drug to provide control, or comparison, groups.

To test learning ability, all of the rabbits were exposed to the sound of a tone, immediately followed by a mild burst of air against the eye. The air burst causes the eye to blink.

This process was repeated 80 times a day. The researchers measured how soon and how often the rabbits learned to anticipate the burst of air by closing their eyes at the sound of the tone.

## Educators, lawmakers debate small schools

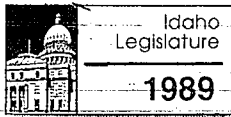

BOISE — Seven students attend Elk River High School this year. Some years only one student graduates.

But as long as at least one student remains enrolled there the state will send the school district about \$250,000 each year to keep the high school open.

There's something not quite fair about that, says a state Department of Education committee, especially since Elk River buses students to the nearest neighboring district for joint athletic programs.

The Department of Education proposes requiring high schools to have at least 60 students — or 80 for a combined junior high and



high school — or prove they are remote and necessary schools and entitled to receive the base state payment of \$250,000.

Thursday, the House and Senate education committees asked the patrons of state school districts what they thought.

Three hours of dueling anecdotes and statistics later, the message was clear, if conflicting. Patrons from large school districts

said they like some of the money the small schools now receive. Patrons from small districts said they didn't want the state saying what was best for their children.

Mike Telford has a bright, but learning-disabled son who used to attend school in Paul. But his son got lost in the Minidoka School District, he said. Seeing his son standing alone on the edge of the playground "would tear your heart out."

Three years ago he began sending his son to Dietrich, a small school that would not meet the proposed student minimum. His son has thrived there under the individual attention, Telford said. "He's getting the help he needs."

But Jack Durham, a former Shoshone resident, said he sees the money spent at the Di-

etrich School District as money that could have been used to improve the education his sons received in neighboring Shoshone. Shoshone, as a larger school district, receives less money per student than Dietrich under the state funding formula.

A son who graduated from Oklahoma State University had to scramble to catch up with other students who had received better high school educations, Durham said.

He has since moved to Boise. His younger son now has a wide variety of foreign language and college preparatory classes from which to choose. "He thanks me," Durham said.

"What money Idaho has for schools needs to be spent fairly," said Donna Hibbard, a Shoshone School District trustee.

If the Legislature approves the department's proposal, six of 16 schools that could be affected are in the Magic Valley. Two are in Lincoln County — Richfield and Dietrich. The third district in the county is Shoshone.

While Dietrich spends \$247,728 in tax dollars to educate 60 secondary students, Shoshone spends \$347,527 to educate 163 secondary students.

But as frustrating as Hibbard as the differences in money in the limited programs the districts offer, each a carbon copy of the one next to it.

"We have three basketball teams, but no debate," she said. "We have three music programs — minimal programs — but no art." School districts shouldn't exist just because

## Burley mission gets nod

BURLEY — A group interested in establishing a rescue mission in Burley was given the go-ahead by the Burley City Council this week.

The council granted a variance to fire codes, enabling the group, comprised of members of the Paul Congregational Church, the Burley Episcopal Church and other interested people, to begin negotiating with Ludwig Haight to acquire a downtown building for the mission.

The group would like to lease or buy an older two-story building on the corner of Oakley and Main diagonally across from the Burley Theatre. The variance was needed because a mezzanine floor in the building had ceilings less than the seven-foot minimum set by the code.

Council members, expressing some concern over the safety of the building, earlier met with the group to tour the building. Building Inspector Keith Bryan told the council that he felt the building would be structurally sound with the remodeling the group plans.

But two councilmen — David Gibbons and Leonard King — said they are still concerned about the safety of the building and voted against the variance, while Clay Handy, Derlin Taylor and Vern Jackson provided the necessary votes for approval.

King, a long-time general building contractor in the area, said Thursday he is concerned that the first-floor ceiling may not be strong enough to support the weight of a potential 50 people in the room above. The group plans to put a sleeping ward on the second floor.

"I can see no way that with 50 people up there that that can hold that strain," King said. He suggests building a wall on the first floor to help support the ceiling.

Bill Williams of Rupert, helping spearhead the mission project, said plans are to build a wall on the first floor for fire codes that also will be a support.

Williams said representatives of the group hope to meet within two weeks with Haight to discuss leasing the building. Eventually, they'd like to buy it but that will have to wait, he said.

"At this point in time we're not ready to buy it because we're a fledgling organization and this is a new adventure for us," Williams said.

Renovation costs likely will run at least \$2,000, Williams said, but he expects a lot of volunteer help. "I think from talking with people when it comes time for labor we'll have a lot of volunteers," he said.

Churches and other groups and individuals also have said they'll donate clothing and other materials, he added.

In other action, the council voted to dismiss a city lawsuit against Massachusetts General Life Insurance Co. in exchange for promises by the company to clean up its Ponderosa Inn property.

The property, unused for several years, is a safety hazard, city officials say.

In addition to the unkempt grounds, the building has broken glass in windows and doors and other problems.

The council unanimously approved granting permission to 10 airplane owners to lease space at the Burley Airport to build private hangars.

The group of pilots had visited the council previously to find out what would be required for the structures. They have been working with the airport committee to make sure the structures will meet with building codes and be aesthetically pleasing.

## Arizona case could leave Idaho death penalty in air

BOISE — A recent federal appeals court decision in an Arizona case could leave the status of Idaho's death penalty law "in limbo," Idaho Supreme Court Justice Robert Huntley Jr. says.

His comments came Thursday as the attorney for condemned Jerome County murderer Jaimi Charboneau argued that a Dec. 22 ruling by the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals invalidates Idaho's death penalty law and the sentences handed down against all 16 men on the state's Death Row.

"These people are all going to have to be reinstated," Greg Fuller told the high court. "And that could be a difficult situation since some of them have been there quite a few years."

Charboneau, 29, of Jerome, was convicted and sentenced to death by 5th District Judge Phillip Becker for the July 1984 shooting death of his ex-wife, Marilyn Arbaugh.

Her bullet-riddled body was found outside her rural Jerome County home after Charboneau allegedly stalked her for several days. Fuller and state Solicitor General Lynn Thomas presented oral arguments on the potential impact of the appellate court's ruling on Charboneau's case.

The San Francisco-based circuit court ruled 11-4 that an Arizona law giving judges rather than juries the authority to issue sentences in capital cases, such as murder, was unconstitutional.

Idaho allowed jury involvement in sentencing in capital cases for more than 80 years, but it now is among only four states with death penalty statutes that leave sentencing exclusively to judges.

And since the wording of Arizona's law is similar to Idaho's, Huntley said, "We stand the possibility of being in limbo in this state for a year," until the Arizona case is heard by the U.S. Supreme Court.

Idaho's law allows judges to issue death sentences in cases where the crime includes "aggravating circumstances," such as being "especially heinous, atrocious or cruel, manifesting exceptional depravity."

But Fuller said the appeals court found that determining which elements of a crime are aggravating or mitigating, and should be considered in sentencing, is a finding of fact that is the responsibility of a jury.

Even if shifting a judge to determine aggravating circumstances were allowable, Fuller said, Idaho's law is so vaguely written that people who have been sentenced to death since it was adopted in 1977 have been denied the constitutional right to due process of law.

"It sounds to me like you're saying we're in a Catch 22 situation and there's no way out," Chief Justice Allan Shepard said.

"That may be true, because the statute is so bad," Fuller replied, contending the Supreme Court should immediately order new sentencing proceedings with jury involvement.

But Thomas called the Circuit Court decision in the Arizona case "an aberration" and "an unfortunate example of grasping at straws to reach a desired result."

He said the ruling ignored the fact that defendants are entitled to have a death sentence made more consistently by judges since they are trained in the law and familiar with standards set by statute and court

## Opponents argue US West rate cut

Say phone firm is hiding its profits

TWIN FALLS — Belief that US West Communications is hiding large profits was the main objection raised by opponents of a \$8.5 million telephone rate reduction.

At an Idaho Public Utilities Commission hearing Wednesday in Twin Falls, Bill Chisholm of Buhl said the PUC should do a full-scale investigation of US West's profits.

"The public deserves to know whether we're getting a sweetheart deal," he said.

Other speakers, however, said they like the proposed reduction and think US West is providing fine service.

"The proposed reduction comes in response to alleged overearnings by US West, formerly known as Mountain Bell. A utilities commission staff preliminary investigation last summer estimated the overearnings may be as high as \$18 million per year.

Overearning means the company's profit on its investment is higher than the commission allowed.

US West felt the overearnings were considerably less, said US West spokesman Rick Hays.

"We believe the \$8.5 million is a fair number," Hays said. "It's a good compromise."

The company agreed to the compromise because it means a speedier settlement, Hays said.

That means customers would see the rate reduction much sooner than if the commission and the company locked horns in a full-blown rate proceeding.

The compromise means that Magic Valley customers could see a rate reduction as soon as March, if all goes well, Hays said.

Ten people testified at the hearing. Seven favored the proposal; three opposed it, basically because they want a more thorough investigation and contend the reduction may not be low enough.

"There are probably things there we would all find very interesting," Uluhvti of Twin Falls said. "If it is \$18 million we're talking about we should be getting \$18 million back."

"Twin Falls City Councilman Rick Carr said he came to counteract the negative comments usually prevalent at such hearings.

"I'm very pro-US West," he said. The utility has been very helpful to the City Council on city projects and with its business recruiting efforts.

"In business recruiting, telecommunications has never been a shortcoming for the area. I assume it's because they have always been adequate."

Kymn Pekkham of Buhl said US West serves business interests well and is making a huge profit, but is doing little for residential customers.

"I assume the PUC exists to protect the public," he said. But improvements in service have been superficial, he said.

In 1979 his phone bill was \$9 a month; now it is \$19, and he still can't call seven miles from his home without paying a long-distance charge, he said.

US West only agreed to the rate reduction to avoid further investigation of their books, he said.

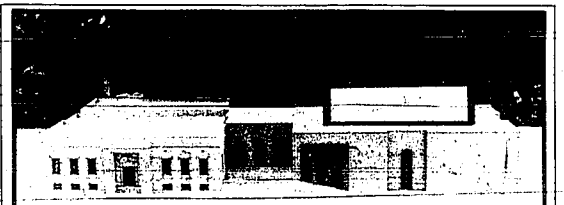
Leah Groves of Twin Falls told the commission, "I am a senior citizen and I'm delighted to take any little reduction I can get."

She expressed happiness with her phone service, and sympathy for the commissioners' "order ahead" in having to decide this issue.

The \$8.5 million figure is a negotiated figure between US West and the PUC's staff, said commission Chairman Ralph Nelson.

The PUC will either accept or reject the proposal. If it rejects the figure, an eight-month rate investigation case will ensue, he said.

The commission will decide before March 1.

## Model, drawings show how new library would look

TWIN FALLS — A newly unveiled scale model and drawings give an idea of how the city library could look if an estimated \$1.6 million addition is approved in a bond election, officials say.

The \$350 scale model, built by Boise architect Gary Eichelberg, and the \$500 drawings, drawn by Twin Falls architect Harold Gerber, are on display in the library.

The library's board of trustees commissioned the renderings to comply with a federal grant application requirement, said Library Director Arlene Call. Idaho State Library officials told Call Wednesday the city has been awarded the \$340,000 federal grant for library expansion.

The preliminary model and drawings are not meant to be a final picture of what is proposed, but they give state officials and the public an idea of what could happen, Call said.

Another proposal is to build a new library at a new site.

Call encouraged people to come see the scale model and share their impressions with staff members.

A final proposed building plan will be completed once the 30-member Library Expansion Advisory Panel completes its study of library growth needs and makes its recommendation.

The panel was formed in October to consider the library's growth needs for the next 20 years, Call said.

During February, dubbed Twin Falls Library Appreciation Month by Mayor Doug Vollmer, the panel is presenting its findings in a series of meetings with educators, elderly people, civic leaders and the general public.

Although the full panel has not decided whether to recommend keeping the library where it is, two key subcommittees — the site selection committee and the cost analysis committee, have stated their preference for staying and expanding the building by 20,000 square feet.

# Filer to give residents water bill break for letting water run

FILER — Residents here will get a break on their water bills if they leave their taps running to help avoid frozen pipes.

The area's air mass hovering over the area has led the Filer City Council to encourage residents to leave their water taps running and the council voted to offer residents a "reasonable credit" to offset the cost of the wastewater factor.

The council did not decide on a specific amount or percentage but Mayor Robert Fort said he would have the city calculate a reasonable credit amount to be applied to water bills.

The exact amount of the credit will be announced at a later date, Fort said.

Public Works Director Bud Compher said the city has placed 11 water meters — at about \$35 each — since Saturday.

Fire Department employees received a 50-cent an hour raise, retroactive to Jan. 1. The meeting, held last week, was very positive, Councilman Russell Sheridan Jr. said. "The raise will, to some degree, improve communications between the council and the department," he said.

The city was granted to help defray the increased cost of Social Security insurance. Sheridan said that the employees will actually net 1.5 cents of the raise, because Social Security insurance will take the remainder.

Paul Nelson and Brad Williamson of McMullen McPhee in Twin Falls reported on the

city's annual audit. The city is in good shape, Nelson said, although the audit document does show a deficit in some categories. Fort said the city has accumulated a surplus over the past few years and the city has been spending the surplus for improvements.

On paper, 1988 revenues were less than expenditures. However, the difference is the amount of the surplus carried over.

Surplus monies have been spent on pipe for the sewer and water systems and for remodeling the city water plant to accommodate some sewer and water lines in the near future. Some of the surplus money and revenue sharing money received this summer has also been used to remodel City Hall.

Police Chief Don Barkley has resigned, the former lawyer, turning it into police of-

fices and a City Council chamber.

Barkley, a former carpenter, has done the work himself on his days off. "He has saved us probably thousands of dollars in labor costs," Fort said.

In other business:

"The Idaho Department of Transportation has designated May 1-6 as Clean-Up Week. Filer plans to coordinate a city clean-up during that week.

"In a letter to the City Council, the Filer Chamber of Commerce attempted to recruit new members. The chamber is interested in planning such projects as a Filer brochure, a walk and bike path and signs welcoming people to Filer. Chamber members and those interested in chamber projects are invited to attend meetings the second and fourth

Thursday of the month at 11:30 a.m. at Cedar Lanes.

Compher reported that the Quick Response Unit has merged with the Fire Department.

QRU President Dave Nunez and Tom Fisher have completed the outfitting of the QRU van, donated by Mountain Bell Telephone Co. "The people are to be commended," Compher said.

The state has inspected the van and is impressed with it, he said. The QRU received a \$3,500 revenue sharing grant from Filer to equip the van.

Wanda Shaffer was elected to serve as the council president. Shaffer was nominated by Councilman Brent Reinke. No other nominations were made.

## Attempt to obtain local courtroom crawls along

**TWIN FALLS** — A move to obtain a local courtroom for federal bankruptcy cases is crawling through the federal bureaucracy.

Idaho's federal judges recently approved the idea, said Jerry L. Clapp, clerk of the U.S. District Court for Idaho.

Clapp faces a two-step process to get final approval: First the U.S. 9th Circuit Judicial Council must approve the idea, and then the U.S. Judicial Council must give the final stamp of approval.

The two councils are composed of federal judges and court administrators.

"We're within a year and we're just beginning," Clapp said.

Clapp, in response to local requests, is trying to rent a room in Twin Falls for a few days a month. Under the current system, litigants must drive to Boise or Pocatello for hearings.

That means bankrupt clients and their creditors must pay attorney for travel time.

## Heyburn City Council listens to new door-to-door ordinance

**HEYBURN** — Heyburn City Council Wednesday heard the first reading of a new ordinance to replace an existing one, which prohibits door-to-door selling and has been found unconstitutional in an Idaho court.

The new ordinance would prohibit solicitors from coming to the homes of people who leave their addresses at City Hall and require solicitors to register.

People wishing to sell door to door will be required to buy a peddlers license for \$20 before doing business in Heyburn.

At that time they will be required to give a home base phone number and address. They will also be given a list of addresses they must avoid.

Heyburn resident Renae Peterson is taking the place of Recreation Director Darrin Uscola. Uscola had asked the council to find a replacement for him, at least temporarily, for personal reasons. Peterson will finish with the basketball program.

"Individuals want their own private school," she said. The three districts together graduated 35 students last year.

"If you close the school, you close the community," said Dietrich Superintendent Wayne Perron. "I think the kids in rural Idaho deserve to have their schools."

Rural schools are more expensive to operate than large schools, but they have advantages, he said. In 22 years as superintendent, only four students have dropped out of his school.

"I don't think you are wasting money when you save students," he said. "People just assume consolidation will improve schools. I believe it will not."

Whether substantial amounts of money would be saved is debatable.

The \$250,000 payment the state's tiniest schools automatically receive now spurred the current debate.

Superintendent of Public Instruction Jerry Evans said that of the 16 schools identified as possibly affected by the minimum student proposal, about half would probably be declared remote and necessary by the state Board of Education.

That means the state could cut off payment to the rest, totaling around \$2 million.

Elmer Ghesey said she was convinced that consolidation would be a gold mine for the state when she was named the League of Women Voters' representative on a second Department of Education task force.

She did her own study to prove her point. She hypothetically combined 22 districts they have discussed consolidation — such as Murtagh,

Mike Myers, chairman of the cost committee said expansion would cost about \$1.2 million but construction of a new building, which would cost about \$2.8 million.

If the city expands the library, the addition would cost about \$1.2 million, but to refurbish the old building would require about \$60,000 for a utilities upgrade, \$36,000 for a new sprinkling system, \$50,000 for structural renovation, \$30,000 for an elevator, \$100,000 for architectural fees and an unspecified amount to purchase neighboring residential lots for parking lot, Myers said.


The bi-level addition would be built on the existing parking lot, according to the scale model. Parking would be at the library's rear, Galt said.

A library consulting firm that last summer studied library expansion needs for the city suggested the city would need to buy lots to five neighboring residential lots for a parking lot.

The \$240,000 federal grant is contingent on the city's ability to match the grant money, which it could do if residents approve a library building project in a bond election, Galt said.


He said the city has not been given a time limit for using the money. A deadline will likely be given once state, city and library officials meet, possibly later in the month.

Judges' instructions to legally un-schooled jurors considering whether a crime was "especially heinous" or "atrocious" almost inevitably would result in an endless exercise in semantics, Thomas said.

The ruling raises questions of federal constitutional law that ultimately will have to be decided by the U.S. Supreme Court, he said, and Idaho's statute should be presumed constitutional until they are.

Shepard said he would "tent to agree."

"I don't see any particular problem with letting them (death penalty cases) sit... until these federal courts finally straighten up their acts and let us mere mortals here what the law really is," he said.

Huntley said he was concerned that if the appellate court decision is upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court ultimately upholds it on appeal. "We will have wasted a year to a year and a half on trials that will have to be held over again."

But Thomas said it was likely only one or two new Idaho cases would involve a possible death penalty before the U.S. Supreme Court acts.

"At this point we consider it premature to do anything about changing the statute, because we don't think the appellate decision is good law," he said.

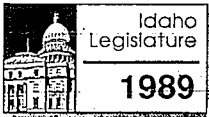

# Business leaders ask lawmakers to support southern Idaho roads

BOISE - Twin Falls and Buhl business leaders lobbied the Legislature Thursday, afraid that in the state's drive to improve U.S. 95 in northern Idaho, the southern part of the state would be forgotten.

"They asked the Senate Commerce and Labor Committee to remember the economic benefits of improving U.S. 93, heading south from Twin Falls to Jackpot and Wells, Nev., and improving the Clear Lakes Grade, which connects farmers on the north side of the Snake River with processing plants on the south."

"The ideal would be a four-lane road, capable of handling the thousands of trucks heading south Idaho with goods for Los Angeles and other destinations," said Kent Just, executive vice president of the Greater Twin Falls Area Chamber of Commerce, about highway improvements. "It is now the preferred route and companies like Independent Meat, Design Master Windows, Universal Foods, Bakker Brothers and countless others are sending trucks out in the evening for arrival in Los Angeles the following morning."

According to Idaho Transportation Department figures, 2,900 vehicles a day travel south on Highway 93 from Twin Falls to the Nevada border. Four hundred of those are trucks.

But "the road goes both ways," Just said. Improving the highway, and encouraging Nevadans to do the same, would increase tourism from California and Arizona, he said.

"There is no question that Highway 95 is deserving of a lot of attention from this body," Just said. This fall the state Transportation Board doubled the amount of money the state will spend over the next six years to widen and improve the highway, the state's main north-south road.

"However," Just said, "we are fearful that legislators and those in the transportation section of state government may be leaning towards putting all of their eggs in one basket, leaving sorely needed improvements to Highway 93 on the shelf for another year or years."

Figured in business dollars, improving Highway 93 may be more important to the state than improving Highway 95, he said.

The Clear Lakes Grade project would also produce more jobs and

business growth than the Highway 95 project, said Bill Specht, chairman of the Buhl Economic Council.

The future expansion of Pet Inc. and Pillsbury/Green Giant is questionable because large trucks cannot safely negotiate the grade to reach Interstate 84, Specht said. Instead they must travel miles out of their way on Highway 30.

The grade was built in the 1930s for Model-T's, he said. It is only 18 to 20 feet wide, has no guard rails, an unstable base built over the aquifer and a 10 percent grade, he said.

Yet during the fresh corn pack, trucks travel it every four minutes carrying corn to the Green Giant plant and carry silage away.

"The reason we're here is letting the state know it's sitting back facing a great liability if something goes wrong," said Green Giant plant Manager Darrel McRoberts.

If a truck should break through the road and spill diesel fuel into the water running constantly beneath the bottom of the grade, thousands of fish at nearby hatcheries could be killed and the water polluted, he said.

The state Transportation Department has agreed the grade needs to be replaced, but McRoberts estimated that construction is 10 years away yet. The project would cost \$2.7 million.

# Just say no - Hansen schools fight drugs using Project Impact approach

HANSEN - The schools here will participate in a drug awareness program becoming increasingly popular in the Magic Valley.

Marcia Lanting told the School Board Monday about Project Impact, which seeks to identify and help kids who abuse drugs or alcohol.

Up to five teachers and administrators will attend a training session tentatively set for fall. Once trained, the teachers will form a "core team" to provide a systematic, supportive and planned approach to identifying and working with chemically dependent students. "The program will begin after the training."

"There is a problem, no one can deny that there is a problem," Lanting, coordinator of the program in Twin Falls, said.

The team will be run by health and physical education teacher Renca Remaley, Hansen schools' drug awareness coordinator.

"I feel we have one of the best drug education programs in the state of Idaho," Remaley said. She plans to use the program to educate parents and students as well.

Remaley has implemented the

'Here's Looking at You Too' program in the elementary school. The program is doing very well she said.

Money to fund the training of the core team will come from a grant written by Remaley last year. The federal grant requires the school to include public participation.

The program is implemented to a variety of degrees in schools around the Magic Valley. One phase of the program is Natural Helpers, which trains students to be peer counselors, helping fellow-students with problems. In addition to Twin Falls, Jerome and Dietrich use the program.

"This is probably the most positive thing in Twin Falls schools," Lanting said of the program.

In other business, Superintendent Richard Smith said that Hansen Elementary School has been approved by the State Department of Education as meeting education requirements of Northwest Accreditation, which sets the requirements. The school, however, will be on the advised list until it has a certified principal. Interim Principal Linda Rutledge is expected to be certified by this fall.

The secondary school is fully accredited, Smith said. The accreditation organization has requested that

the secondary school solve the need for a counselor.

In other action, the life-time sports class received board approval to use school buses for a ski trip. The class will ski Magic recreation area Feb. 24.

The music department received approval to sell tickets to a production called Solo's night. Student's will perform both instrumental and voice solos. The date and time is to be announced.

The PTO reported the Winterfest program a success. The organization made about \$1,300 on the event.

The Bureau of air quality will install a monitor on the roof of the elementary school building. The monitor will be read weekly by the sixth grade teacher, Terry Dowd. In return, Dowd's class will receive air quality reports to be used for environmental studies.

The board approved a waiver from the 90 percent attendance rule for five students. The cases were discussed in closed session. The five involved were excused due to illness and/or surgery during the fall.

The next regularly scheduled School Board meeting will be at 4 p.m. Feb. 21. The date and time is changed due to the President's Day holiday on Feb. 20.

# Runyan leaves Castleford City Council

CASTLEFORD - Council member Carby Runyan told the Castleford City Council at its meeting Wednesday that he will no longer be able to serve on the council because he plans to take a job out of state.

"The council will appoint someone to complete Runyan's term. The new council person must have lived in the town for at least 30 days and currently must be a resident. Anyone interested can contact City Clerk Patsy Kinyon.

Castleford says last year just its longtime mayor, Robert Sample, who resigned to work in Nevada. The council appointed Richard Schlund, council chairman at the time, to fill

the remainder of Sample's term. Schlund reported that there had been some response to the clean-up notices the city mailed last month to the owners of certain lots on Main Street.

Some weeds have been removed, he said, and "as soon as the weather improves we'll pursue this further."

The city has an ordinance allowing it to hire someone to clean the lots of people who don't do it themselves and then charge them for the cost of the clean-up.

The council decided that it will ask the Twin Falls County Sheriff's Department to help patrol the city, especially during the afternoons.

"We need to control the exit out of town when school gets out," Schlund said.

The council has received complaints, not only about student drivers, but also about trucks speeding through town. The school is located on the highway that intersects town. The speed limit through town is 20 mph.

Castleford has two police officers but both work as police only part time and are not able to patrol after school on a consistent basis.

In other business, the council reminds city residents that the water rates in Castleford will increase by \$2 per month.

Beginning March 1, water rates will be \$12.50 per month, bringing the monthly city services bill to \$35.

The increase is needed to help pay for the \$17,000 repair that was done to the city water tank.

# Rupert water safe to drink

RUPERT - The City Council heard a report this week on the condition of residential drinking water.

Councilman Dwimelle Alfred told the council he has received a number of calls from concerned citizens over the periodic reddish-brown color of the drinking water.

Irvin Hardy, Water Department superintendent, told the council the water is not hazardous. "The color is caused by temporary elevations of iron and manganese, but the levels have never been above normal specifications for human consumption," Hardy said.

Test samples are sent seven times a month to the state lab in Boise to be analyzed and the bacteria count

and lead levels are consistently well within normal range, Hardy said.

The council agreed to Alfred's suggestion that laboratory findings be included periodically on utility bills.

In other matters, the council is still accepting and reviewing comments from citizens regarding the resolution limiting beer consumption at city parks during ball games.

Councilman Alfred reported his feasibility study on the computer equipment needed for the city utility company. After hearing his findings, the council decided to purchase a new system instead of upgrading the old equipment.

# Officials find jet's cockpit voice recorder

VILA DO PORTO, Azores Islands (AP) — Authorities on Thursday found the cockpit voice recorder of a chartered U.S. jetliner that slammed into a mountain and killed all 144 people aboard, and they recovered the remains of all but two of the dead.

Rescuers called off the search for the two bodies still missing, saying it would be impossible to find them on the heavily forested slopes of Pico Alto mountain where the jet crashed Wednesday. Antonio Alves of the Civilian Aviation Authority said it was hoped the recorder would help explain

why the pilot steered the Boeing 707 directly into the mountain while trying to land in a fog. The seven-member American crew and the 137 passengers — Italian tourists headed to a Caribbean vacation — were killed.

In Lisbon, Cmdr. Jose Pastor of the aviation authority said the pilot, Capt. Leon Daugherty, had acknowledged the airport control tower's authorization of a safety altitude of 3,000 feet during the landing approach.

Pastor said the plane struck the mountain at an altitude of about 1500 feet.

"There was no — repeat no — communication of an emergency landing request by the pilot," he said. Earlier reports indicated the pilot may have asked to make an emergency landing.

Alves said it appeared the aircraft had been on the proper course to land. It was to refuel on Santa Maria island before continuing on to the Dominican Republic.

Alves said the cockpit voice recorder had been recovered, but the flight data recorder, which contains information on the aircraft's flight parameters, had not yet been found.

## Burmese workers to receive pay boost

RANGOON, Burma (AP) — The government will grant pay raises to its workers, who have faced tenfold price rises over 27 years with little or no salary increases, state radio said Thursday.

The radio gave no details on the

amount of raises, which it said will be effective April 1. Civil servants now earn from \$23 to \$235 a month.

The cost of many consumer goods, including food, have risen tenfold or more in the last 27 years. Government pay has remained the same.

## Iraq's Hussein foils military coup

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — President Saddam Hussein of Iraq has foiled a military coup attempt that may have included plans to bomb his reviewing stand on Armed Forces Day, diplomats in Baghdad report.

They said he remains firmly in control of the nation. He has ruled for a decade and would not have visited North Yemen in mid-January if he had been worried.

Reports of the coup attempt centered on air force officers from Samarra, whose people are traditional rivals of Hussein's clan in Tikrit, another provincial town.

An Armed Forces Day parade scheduled for Jan. 6 was canceled, without explanation, and European defense ministers who had been invited were asked to stay away.

Some diplomats in the Iraqi capital said the plan was for three air force planes to bomb the president's reviewing stand.

While acknowledging details were sketchy, they pointed to the absence in public of Air Marshal Hamid Shaban, the air force commander highly decorated by Hussein during the eight-year war with Iran. They said this indicated a plot, and said Shaban might have been executed.

Others said the attempt was made while Hussein

visited Egypt in December, with the result that up to 200 military officers and members of the ruling Baath Socialist Party were executed.

Dissident Kurdish groups and Iraqi exiles have reported the executions.

Earlier reports said a top military commander disappeared just after the Aug. 20 cease-fire in the war with Iran and two others died in mysterious helicopter crashes.

Hussein, 61, became vice president when the Baath Socialist Party seized power in 1968 and has been president since 1979. He rose through the political ranks, not the military.

Iraq was plagued by coups before the Baath party took over, and Islamic fundamentalist groups loyal to Iran tried to assassinate Hussein several times in the early years of the war.

He has controlled the military by appointing members of his Tikrit clan to the most sensitive posts and keeping other officers in line with a combination of favoritism and purges.

The diplomats speculate that plotters may have been encouraged by trouble within Hussein's tight-knit clan over his treatment of his eldest son, Qdai, who killed a favorite presidential bodyguard.

## Israeli troops stage roundup

JERUSALEM (AP) — Soldiers rounded up about 175 Palestinians in the West Bank on Thursday and forced them to sit blindfolded and bound for up to 16 hours in a soccer stadium, Arab and Israeli witnesses said.

Riots erupted outside the Megiddo Prison for a second straight day after Arab reports circulated that a second Palestinian had died of wounds sustained in a riot there Wednesday, Israeli radio reported.

The radio said Thursday's riot was quickly subdued by prison guards and there were no casualties.

Police said an Israeli settler killed when his car went up in flames in the West Bank on Wednesday appeared to be the victim of a terror attack, but an investigation was continuing.

"It is reasonable to be terrorist," West Bank police commander Haim Malcha said on Israel radio.

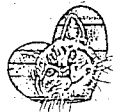

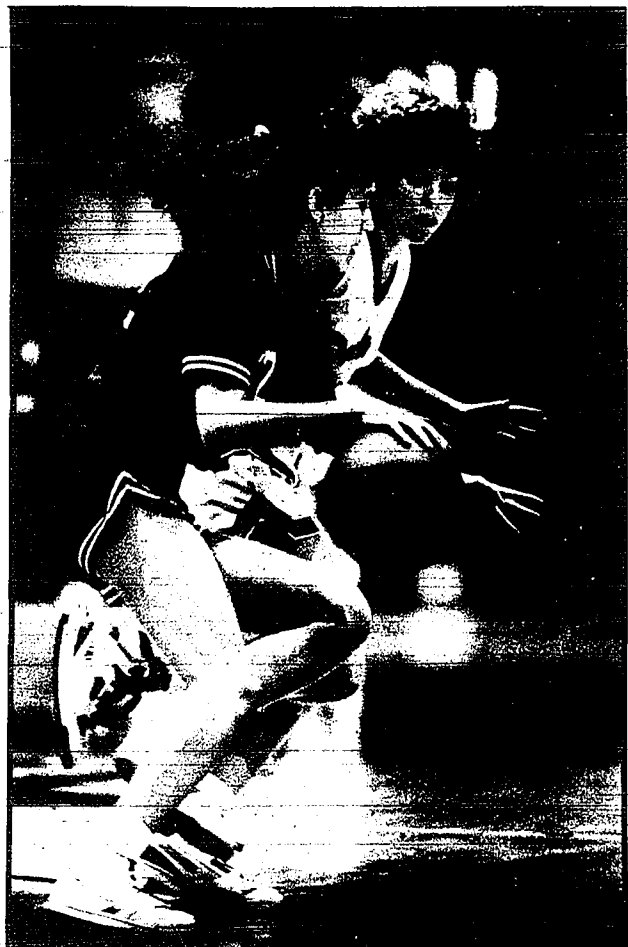

Prairie, 20-6, will meet West Jefferson, 23-2, in the other semifinal at 6:25 p.m., while Malad, 19-3, and New Plymouth, 17-7, will play a loser-out contest at 12:20 p.m.

Challis 74, Declo 70

Things began to go wrong for Declo, which had dominated the first half defensively, when senior guard Angie Tanner was whistled for her fourth foul with 6 minutes and 9 seconds left in the third quarter with the Hornets leading 47-39. Tanner, who had four steals in the first half, stayed for most of the rest of the game, but she didn't get another steal.

Tanner's backcourt mate Thais Kidd was assessed her fourth foul with 3:34 left in the third quarter, and from that point the Hornets weren't the same team.

"No question, the fouls really hurt us," said Declo coach Lynn Payne. "The foul-court press worked real well in the first half, but after Angie and Ty got into foul trouble, we

couldn't do it anymore."

Challis rallied from a seven-point deficit with 6:26 left in the game to a 64-63 lead on Casey Fisher's free throw two minutes later.

The game got faster in the second half, and I think that was to our advantage," said Challis coach Dow Dean. "We have good speed to go with our size."

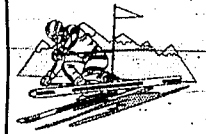

**IDAHO FALLS** — When Jon Wilburn first eased a syringe containing the anabolic steroid Equipoise into his hip, he was hoping to inject fuel into his high school football career.

"I guess I was thinking maybe this is the price you pay to be a better football player," the Idaho Falls High School senior said.

Instead, Wilburn, who played on the Tigers' state championship football team last fall, found steroids are no bargain at all price.

"It was hard to see him feel like an outcast," Wilburn's mother Joan said. "He turned from a very sociable young man into a recluse for a while."

Wilburn has been questioned by Idaho Falls Police Detective Mark McBride about how he obtained the drug. No charges have been filed.

"We're more interested in getting the guy who is supplying the steroids," McBride said. Steroids are not classified as a controlled substance in Idaho, but the drug can be obtained legally only through a prescription. Wilburn, who said he was the only player on the Tiger football team using steroids to his knowledge, began taking the muscle-developing drug in September, just before Idaho Falls' game against Madison High School of Rexburg.

## A perfect season means record streak for Lapwai

"About every week I check their scores in the newspaper," said ex-Teton forward

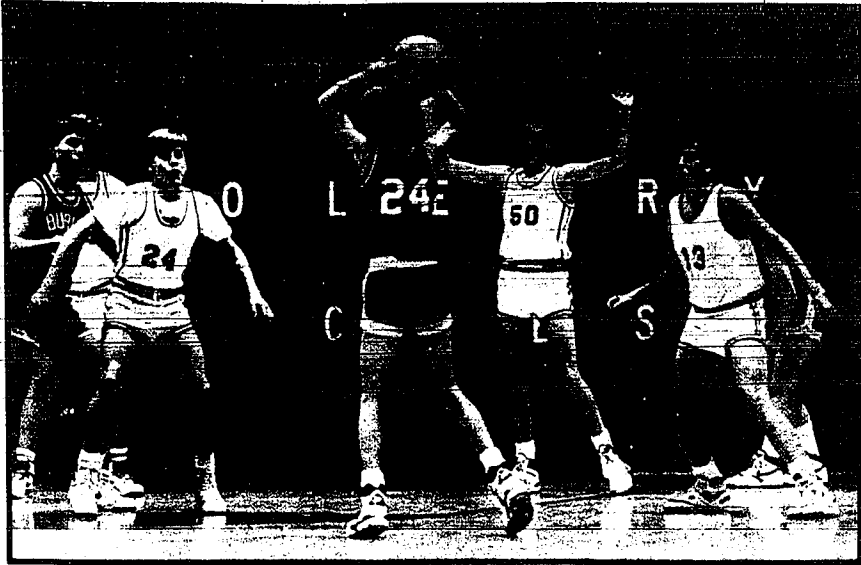
Randy Buxton, now a teacher and coach at Marsden Valley High School in Arimo.

### AN INTERNAL READING

As part of an automobiles engine tune-up, the technician is likely to perform a compression test. This provides a reading of the compression in each of the engine's cylinders and gives an overview of the engine's mechanical condition. Low or uneven compression may indicate an internal problem which prohibits the turn-up from providing peak performance. Low compression may point to a problem with the condition of the piston rings, valves, or head gaskets. If the compression test readings do not meet design specifications, the technician knows that he must locate the cause in an engine component. On the other hand, a good compression test reading provides the technician and the owner with a reasonable assurance that the engine's internals are in good working order.

What about lead-directing doubles? Should a declarer jump at any chance to bid... best lead against an impending slam...

Put yourself in East's chair. After opening one spade and hearing South plunge on toward a slam...

Obviously South is prepared for a spade lead. Should you therefore double six diamonds to ask West to lead that suit?

One East did, and he didn't enjoy the result. West's diamond lead was won by East's ace (South dropping the 10) and the diamond trump was won by dummy's eight.

Without East's lead-directing double, West would undoubtedly have led a spade, and the slam would have failed.

What? When not one of your side's best attacks, you shouldn't leap at just any opportunity to guide the defense.

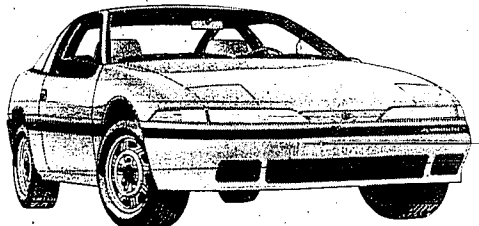

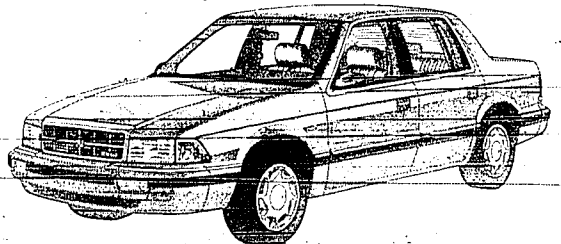

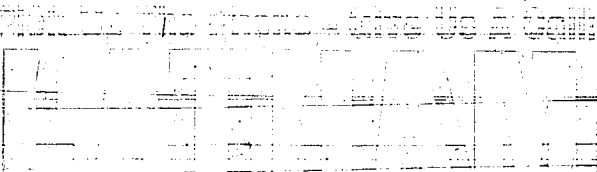

## Rock 'n' roll would never be the same

'Close your eyes and I'll kiss you, tomorrow ...'

The silvery curtains rise, and out he comes, looking more like a mortician than an impresario.

His poker face gives way to a sly grin, knowing he will for once make good on his promise for a "rilly big" show.

After all, 50,000 requests had come in for the 728 seats available in the former Maxine Elliott Theater on 53rd and Broadway in New York, where the "The Ed Sullivan Show" was shot. And all week, hundreds of reporters and photographers had been swarming around the studio — something Sullivan mentions on the air.

"These veterans agree with me that the city has never witnessed the excitement stirred by these youngsters from Liverpool who call themselves the Beatles," he says, raising his hands like a prizefight announcer. "Let's bring 'em out!"

The youthful peals in the audience turn into ear-splitting shrieks as we hear, for the first time: "A, one-two-three-four!" — and Paul McCartney, age 21, begins singing: "Close your eyes and I'll kiss you, tomorrow I'll miss you. ..."

A song like "All My Loving" seems tame enough, with its simple love rhymes, the Carl Perkins-style guitar break, the enthusiastic harmonies. But it was so difficult to concentrate on the music, just looking at them:

Four young men with jet-black mops of hair. Odd, collarless suits and ties. This was something very, very different — and the contrast was even more striking on a Sunday night variety show that was big on European circus acts, Broadway musical acts and borscht-belt comedians.

To the young people who were among the 73 million watching at home — the largest audience up to that time in television history — the performance 25 years ago this week remains as sharp and vivid image of the '60s and of rock 'n' roll history.

If rock 'n' roll music can be crystallized in a minute, if its shift can be pinpointed in a single, pivotal performance, it was this, the first appearance of the Beatles — McCartney, John Lennon, George Harrison and Ringo Starr — on "The Ed Sullivan Show" on Feb. 9, 1964, that was the most historic.

"The event was a pop explosion," rock critic Greil Marcus wrote of that Sullivan show, "and thus far the last that rock 'n' roll has produced." A pop explosion, as defined by Marcus, is "an irresistible cultural upheaval that cuts across lines of class and race and, most crucially, divides society itself by age. The surface of daily life — walk, talk, dress, symbolism, heroes, family affairs — is affected with such force that deep and substantive changes in the way large numbers of people think and act take place."

The Feb. 9 appearance was the first of three straight

## Beatlemania took the country's teens by storm in '64

A little more than two months ago, America observed the 25th anniversary of President Kennedy's assassination. We remembered the shock and disbelief, and especially the dramatic minute-by-minute, hour-by-hour television coverage through four dark days in November 1963.

This week we remember another time, 25 years ago, when the youth of America found relief from the tragedy in Dallas. On Feb. 9, 1964, Ed Sullivan introduced millions of young television viewers to the Beatles.

In celebration of 25 years of Beatlemania, the Times-News asked those who had seen or met the Fab Four to share some of their special memories:

**Fred Bos, 48, Hagerman.** (From 1964 through 1969, Bos worked for Fender guitar in Los Angeles, where he met two of the Beatles.)

"One afternoon my boss came in and told me and all the other store managers not to leave after the rest of the employees had gone home. Af-

ter the other employees had gone, he told us that two of the Beatles were coming into the store to check out some new lines of equipment. He expressed that there would be no asking for autographs, and that their visit was strictly business.

As Bos remembers, it was only a short time later when Paul McCartney and George Harrison walked into the store. "Those of us who chose to stay under the 'business only' conditions were able to shake their (Paul and George) hands," Bos says. "And we spent their entire visit discussing and showing them new Fender equipment. It was great!"



**Jean Robertson, 40, Twin Falls.** "My sisters and I were 'Beatles' crazy, probably more than most girls. We had our bedroom plastered from floor to ceiling with every piece of Beatles paraphernalia

we could get our hands on. People used to stop by our house just to look in our bedroom. It was a sight!"

"When the Beatles first came to LA County, where I grew up, I won tickets to see them through radio station KRLA. The D.J. at the time was Dave 'The Hullabaloo' Hull (who is currently the host of 'TV's Matchmaker')."

"We used to hang out at the airport a lot to see the stars come in and out, and when the Beatles came in, I remember shaking hands with the driver of their limo just to say I'd touched someone associated with the Beatles. Mom drove us to the concert at the Hollywood Bowl, and the closer we got, the more kids we saw waving their Beatles tickets for everyone to see."

**Jan McKenzie, 35, Twin Falls.** "I couldn't get over their long hair, when I first saw them on TV. Paul was always my favorite. I won tickets through a drawing at radio station KISN in Portland, Oregon where I grew up. So in August of '66 I finally got to see them in person at the Memorial Colosseum there in Port-

land. I remember being in awe at the hysteria of the crowd."

**Stacey Raasmussen, 39, Twin Falls.** "I saw the Beatles at the Seattle Colosseum in Washington, where I was raised. Tickets were only around \$5, but my seat was so far away from the stage they looked like ants. Fortunately someone in my group had brought binoculars, and I remember watching a girl crawl up on stage and grab Paul's leg, only to be removed by security guards. I also remember the constant, loud screaming and girls crying. It was deafening. After the concert, there was a mass stampede when someone mistakenly thought they had seen one of the Beatles and yelled 'There they are!'"

**Carleen Pederson, 40, Twin Falls.** "I was visiting relatives in Vancouver B.C. when I got to see them (the Beatles). What amazed

me most about the concert was the steady stream of girls that had fainted and were being carried out by security guards."



**Cassandra Blakely, 42, Filor.** "I was born in San Diego, and had the opportunity to tour with Bob Hope doing U.S.O. shows. I got to see the Beatles perform at the San Diego Sports Arena some time in '64 or '65. I remember all the swooning and carrying on during the concert, and questioned what it was all about. Myself, I looked for some masculinity in them and didn't really see any. It wasn't the Beatles themselves I liked — it was the Beatles' music."

**Bob Wright, 42, Boise-Twin Falls.** "I'll never forget that sunny day in mid-summer in the '60s when three friends of mine and I headed for a Beatles concert at the Washington,

D.C. football stadium. We were 'tooling' down Pennsylvania Avenue in a Bonneville convertible all thinking: 'Aren't we cool?' Once we arrived at the stadium, and were seated the anticipation of the concert became intense. The Beatles appeared in a stretch limo in the middle of the stadium, jumped on the stage, and the crowd went wild. The acoustics were horrible, as would be expected in an outdoor stadium, but no one seemed to mind."

"The fans went wild, many of whom jumped onto the field and rushed towards the musicians, only to be stopped by police."

"This incident will always remind me of the care-free days when the primary concern of a teenager was making sure that he kept his Brycecream in stock, and his hair didn't get out of sorts in a convertible."

 Sunday night performances by the Beatles on "The Ed Sullivan Show." The second was shot at a Miami hotel, where the rest of the Sullivan show was filming; the third was tape-recorded the same day as the first show. But the first performance still packed an incalculable effect for what seems now to be a variety of reasons.

The rise of television in a majority of homes, before the huge audiences for the three networks were diluted by the addition of cable and independent stations and home video-cassette rental.

The unprecedented promotional effort preceding the band's arrival. — The death of rock 'n' roll immediately before their arrival.

The psychological need for fresh, carefree entertainment after the devastating assassination of President Kennedy less than three months earlier.

The sheer exuberance and skill of the band itself.

Today, a tape of the show — the single most popular tape among the 2,000 available for viewing at New York's Museum of Broadcasting — shows that though the Beatles played a lot of songs, the music was not particularly notable — especially compared with what would come later. From the three shows, only a Lennon-led "This Boy" and maybe a wiggly "Twist and Shout" are the kinds of things you might want to have on record.

They played five songs the first night, mostly featuring Paul singing lead. During the second tune, super-imposed titles appeared under each of the Beatles: "PAUL," "RINGO," "GEORGE" and "JOHN — Sorry Girls, He's Married."

As instant as the success seemed at the time, it did not come overnight.

From the moment the Beatles broke in England in January 1963, we had tried terribly hard to sell them in America, producer George Martin wrote in his 1982 memoir. "All You Need is Ears." "Everything we attempted seemed to meet a resounding slap in the face."

The Beatles' English record label, EMI, could not interest its new U.S. acquisition, Capitol Records, to release "Love Me Do" or "Please Please Me" — or even their first British No. 1 singles, "From Me to You" and "She Loves You."

Eventually they were licensed to a variety of small U.S. labels, Vee-Jay in Chicago (and its subsidiary, Tollie) and Swan Records in Philadelphia, all betting on stateside popularity after the madness overseas. But even though "She Loves You" got some play in 1963, it did not dent the U.S. charts.

It was not until November 1963 that a trip to New York by Beatles manager Brian Epstein netted some results. Not only did Capitol finally agree to release the Beatles' next single, "I Want To Hold Your Hand," during the trip, Epstein also signed a deal for the Beatles to appear on the "Ed Sullivan Show."

Their fee of \$4,000 a show was less than half of what Sullivan usually paid for a major act (indeed, Elvis Presley got \$50,000), but top billing was guaranteed.

Sullivan had witnessed Beatlemania in October 1963 when he was at London's Heathrow Airport as fans

were welcoming the band back from a Stockholm trip. He told The New York Times he did not want to miss out on "the sort of mass hysteria that had characterized the Elvis Presley days."

And, a generation before MTV, both parties knew of the power of rock 'n' roll on television.

Presley's historic waist-up performance on "Ed Sullivan" in 1956 had all but cemented his nationwide popularity and helped keep his single "Don't Be Cruel/Hound Dog" at No. 1 for 11 weeks — still the longest reign of any rock 'n' roll single.

And Epstein knew the start of mass Beatlemania in Britain really began after the band's appearance on the BBC's popular "Sunday Night at the London Palladium" program on Oct. 13, 1963.

The first Beatles appearance on American TV actually came on Jan. 3, 1964, when Jack Paar showed a clip of a British performance of "She Loves You." But it was seen as more of a phenomenon — kids screaming to a group of oddly coiffed youths who sang "Yeah, yeah, yeah."

The Sullivan showcase was much more important because it was live, it came after "I Want To Hold Your Hand" had hit No. 1, and it was concurrent with the continuing media blitz on the mop-topped group: stories in Life magazine, The New Yorker, The New York Times and from the Associated Press.

Of course, promotion helped. The previously uninterested Capitol suddenly invested an unprecedented \$50,000 in promotion, providing Beatles press kits to big-city DJs, plastering lampposts with hundreds of thousands of "The Beatles are Coming" stickers and encouraging regional sales managers to start wearing their enclosed "Beatle hair-do wigs."

Radio stations, anxious to be part of this next big thing, had been plugging the Beatles' arrival for weeks.

More than one analyst has pointed out that America, still mourning the death of its young president a few months earlier, desperately needed an injection of freshness, vigor and fun. The promise of the '60s virtually demanded it.

Moreover, after the jolting birth of rock in the mid-'50s, Presley had gone from the Army to Hollywood, leaving the Top 10 to such middle-of-the-road blandness as Bobby Vinton's "There! I've Said It Again," "Domingo" by the Singing Nun and "I'm Leaving It Up to You" by Dale and Grace — the three previous No. 1 hits before "I Want To Hold Your Hand."

The Beatles' sudden infusion of excitement gave way to total domination.

The seven-week reign of "I Want To Hold Your Hand" on the top of the charts was followed by "She Loves You," in the top spot for two weeks, and "Can't Buy Me Love," at No. 1 for five weeks.

By the time "Can't Buy Me Love" had hit No. 1 in April 1964, the Beatles occupied all of the slots in the Top 5 — "Twist and Shout" was No. 2; "She Loves You" was No. 3; "I Want To Hold Your Hand" was No. 4; and "Please Please Me" was No. 5.

The next week, the Beatles had 10 songs in the Top 100, breaking Presley's record of nine in December 1956.

# Beatlemania invaded the Magic Valley too

Although they had won the hearts and souls of every teen-ager from Hamburg, Germany to their hometown of Liverpool, England, the Beatles were virtually unknown in America, up until the last few weeks of January in '64.

Then, some enterprising executive at Capitol Records (who earlier had refused to sign the Beatles) decided to "Capitalize" on the Beatle craze in England, and launched a \$50,000 media blitz. Needless to say, the blitz worked. By February the second, the Beatles "Want To Hold Your Hand" was No. 1 on the billboard charts.

By the time they landed in America on Feb. 7, the Beatles had become a household name. Not all the words describing them were flattering though.

After sending an ABC camera crew to Kennedy airport to cover the group's first arrival on American turf, newsman Chet Huntley

was unimpressed. "After surveying the film our men returned with, and the subject of that film, I feel there is absolutely no need to show any of that film," he said.

I'd like to have been one of the many thousand fans who lined Kennedy Airport Feb. 7, 1964. But like the bulk of young Americans, I would have to wait two more days to see the "Fab Four."

I don't know what causes us to remember certain events in our lives with such poignant detail, but that first appearance of the Beatles on "The Ed Sullivan Show" comes to mind every time I hear a Beatle song.

I know it's kind of hard to believe, but Tom Leavelle had made his way to Kimberly, Idaho too, and with a little arm-twisting, I convinced my parents to let me stay at a friend's house a little longer so I wouldn't miss the Beatles.

My friend probably still wishes I had gone home and let him watch them in peace. While waiting diligently for Ed Sullivan to introduce the Beatles, we decided to entertain ourselves

with a couple of disposable syringes (this dad was the town doctor). When Ed Sullivan announced, "Ladies and Gentlemen, The Beatles!" I made a wild sweeping motion with my hand, and plunged the needle into my friend's arm.

I talked that friend a few years' back (it was on a Sunday, 20 years to the night of that first Beatles appearance). I hadn't talked to him for probably 12 or 13 years.

"Hi, is this Dr. Ellis McHenry Knight?" I asked.

"Yes" came the reply. "Well, I'm taking a survey," I said. "Can you tell me where you were and what you were doing 20 years ago tonight?"

Pause.

"Are you serious?" came the reply.

Sensing his lack of participation, I asked him: "Were you sitting in your bedroom watching the Beatles on TV?"

Pause. "John, is that you?"

Hey, he remembered!

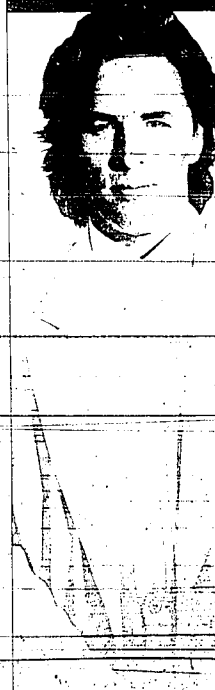
The organist says she would like this recital to be a thank you gift to the community for providing so many musical opportunities for her and her family.

# Griffith, Weaver shine in 'Working Girl'

HOLLYWOOD — The credits list her third, the ads show her peering from behind co-stars Harrison Ford and Sigourney Weaver, but do not be fooled for a minute. "Working Girl" is the sparkling success that it is because of the sheer irresistibility of Melanie Griffith.

Griffith's innovative suggestions, slow to give credit and incapable of sharing the spotlight. Leaving Griffith to do the mental work at a party, she says airily: "You can't busy the quarterback with passing out the Gatorade" (With impregnable self-confidence, actress Weaver slips deliciously into the role, playing the shrewd corporate shrew as though the role had been molded on her).

In short order, however, the "quarterback" is sidelined after an out-of-state skiing accident, leaving the office unattended and the plot boiling. With one of her own canny business ideas at stake, Griffith takes a deep, panicky breath and then poses as Weaver in a proposed deal, bringing her on a collision course with Jack Trainer (Ford), investment broker from another company.

None of the plot twists will astonish you, but they do not have a single boring patch to them either, thanks to Wade's pungent dialogue and Nichols' adroit direction. Best, the film is compassionate, not snide, toward Griffith and her appalled best friend, Cyn (Joan Cusack, remembered most vividly as the harried young assistant producer in "Broadcast News"). Another beautiful home girl with a heroic explosion of teased hair, Cusack is only afraid Griffith is dreaming above her station: "Sometimes I sing and dance around in my underwear," she warns Tess. "It doesn't make the Madonna."

The test recognition of the barriers that hold the Cyns and the Tesses back and the lack of condescension to them in the direction and in Wade's script makes "Working Girl" one of the warmest films that Nichols has touched recently, including "Silkwood" and "Heartburn."

"Working Girl" (rated an astonishing R, for extremely brief nudity and sex) is one of those gorgeous pucks-ages where the film makers count on

us to keep up — always a flattering attitude. So we notice the difference between Weaver's office, overflowing with baskets of roses and tulips and orchid plants at her birthday time, and Griffith's "surprise" birthday party at home.

Sure, the film bends credibility a bit when Griffith has Cusack cut her trendy mane, to give Griffith sufficiently "serious" hair-to-face-the-business world. We all know you don't get serious hair from your best girlfriend and the game shears.

But it's part of the ineffable charm of the Cinderella fable, isn't it?

For audiences already on the Griffith wavelength after "Something Wild" and "Stormy Monday," her role as the tenacious Tess McGill seems tailor-made. But for those who somehow missed the special Griffith blend of moxie and down-to-earth sensuality, this is a chance to meet her in the very best company: romantically entangled with Ford, directed by Mike Nichols and in a savagely funny screenplay by ex-playwright and actor Kevin Wade ("Key Exchange"), no small movie discovery himself.

It is a working-Cinderella story in which Griffith plays a more-than-bright New Yorker with a fierce you to climb out of the secretarial pool at her Wall Street brokerage job. Tess McGill is a connoisseur of all these sharp young girls on the subway or the Staten Island ferry every morning, sneakers on their feet, hopes on their sleeves and disaster in their accents.

But Griffith's McGill is different. Even after she has been graduated from night school with honors, she keeps pushing; burrowing through the Wall Street journal as avidly as she keeps up with "W," taking late-

night speech classes even when it means seeing less of her Staten Island fisherman-boyfriend Mick Dugan (he is Alec Baldwin, Michelle Pfeiffer's gangster husband in "Married to the Mob").

In a way, Tess McGill is like the character Billie Dawn in "Born Yesterday," and Griffith's radiant performance is as much of a personal triumph as Judy Holliday's was in 1950. But back then, Billie Dawn needed a mentor, a man who would bring her innate smarts to the attention of the world — and to Billie herself. Griffith's McGill, a woman of the '80s, already knows what she's got: "A head for business and a bed to have the business half of her taken seriously."

The chance to be secretary to elegant WASP MBA Katharine Parker (Sigourney Weaver) seems the break she has been waiting for. And sure enough, Weaver, welcoming Griffith on board with a pep talk about "input, ideas" and how "hard work gets rewarded," sounds almost too good a boss to be true. She is.

Weaver is actually a one-woman brain-drain, quick to pick up on Griff-

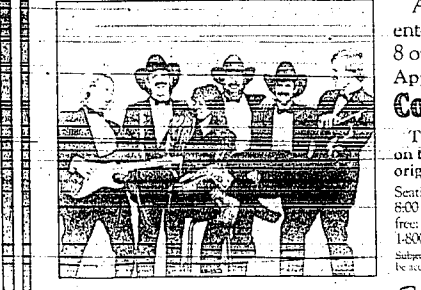

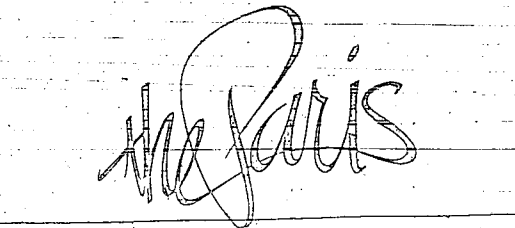

# Ricki Lake goes from 'Hairspray' to lonely woman of 'Babycakes'

Ricki Lake is sick of talking about her weight.

"I hate that it's always an issue," says the heavyset 20-year-old ne-tress. "Like with every interview I do, that's all they want to talk about. I guess that's how it goes, because that's what makes me different from everybody else, but it's frustrating."

It's also ironic, since the clear message of "Hairspray," last spring's surprise hit that turned Lake into a star, is that you can't judge people by their looks. And Lake, who played the girl who could out-dance every teenager in Baltimore, is still a little amazed by the movie's success.

"Everyone else was saying, 'Oh, this is going to be so great,'" says Lake, who sounds just as bubbly on the phone as she was in the movie. "But every movie set is like that. They always think it's going to be the greatest thing. I didn't because the movie I'd done previously never opened. I assumed 'Hairspray' would never open either. I just took it as a summer job and had a good time."

She has been working steadily ever since. This week, in "Babycakes" (CBS, Feb. 14), she stars as a lonely

young woman who spots the man of her dreams (Craig Sheffer) at a skating rink, then pulls out all the stops to snag him.

"It's kind of a sweet story — almost too-sweet," she says. "I think it's unrealistic. But you really feel for her. She's very pitiful in the beginning, and she breaks through all that and becomes a real winner."

Told that we had been thinking of asking her if she had ever tried any of the tricks her character uses herself, she whoops with laughter.

"Are you kidding me? I mean some of the stuff I have to do in the movie — like I have to take a bath with Craig. I adore him. I think he's terrific, but with 50 crew members sitting around, I was a little bit uptight. I've never taken a bath with someone in my own life, let alone on national TV."

She became even more nervous when it came time to film the tub scene and she discovered that the prop man could have done a better job.

"It was a bubble bath," she says, "but when I sat in it, the top of the tub like came up to my waist. They expected one larger-than-life woman and a full grown man to sit in this tub and like be romantic and sexual, yet

it's television, so you can't show anything."

Careful positioning of the two actors — and lots of bubbles — finally enabled them to complete the scene.

Lake presently finds herself at a bit of a crossroads. "I don't want to continually play the fat actress," she says. But she's also uncomfortable with the notion that being a perfect size 6 should be every woman's goal. And although she has purchased a fancy new exercycle ("I think it's now gathering 6 inches of dust, but I'll use it!") and is making a point of eating sensibly, she has always been comfortable with her weight.

"It's never been a hindrance for me," she says. "Even growing up, I was never taunted or teased. I was always the popular one with all the friends. I never lacked boyfriends. And I would never have made it in the business had it not been for my extra pounds."

He can stretch something out if it takes off and have some good stories in reserve. The show's cast of characters also represents a good age range. It's also an easygoing place to work and I think the actors are among the best to be found in TV."

Marie is doing what she always knew she would do — act. When she was 10 she was taken to a touring company production of "Harvey" and fell in love with the magic of the theater. She recalls going around the house pantomiming to opera recordings by Maria Callas.

When she finished college, she took off for New York City. She haunted the agents' offices and got lucky almost immediately. Of course, she had to watch her pennies, so she shared an apartment with six stewardesses at one time.

Marie was cast in the now defunct soap "Love of Life," which was her introduction to daytime TV.

"It was live in those days and you had to remember so many things,

not just your lines. I am always trying to improve my skill and my craft. I took acting classes when I first began and I still go to classes. I guess I'll always be the eternal drama student."

## 'Night Court's' Anderson appeared on late night TV

**Q:** Can you give me some information on Harry Anderson of "Night Court"?

A: Anderson first came to national attention through a series of appearances on "Saturday Night Live" in which he displayed his comic magic act. Born in Newport, R.I., he had a varied career before those appearances as a magician, illusionist and actor. In the late 1970s and early '80s, Anderson and his wife, Leslie, toured college campuses with an act involving knife-throwing, mind reading and escapes. Thanks to the success of "Night Court," he has been a frequent guest and host of various specials, along with his own cable special ("Hello, Sucker") for HBO. This season, he has added "The Absent-Minded Professor" to his roster in a limited series (three episodes, one already shown, the next one due Feb. 26) on "The Magical World of Disney."

**Q:** In the early returns of "Cosby," it is indicated the family only has four kids. Now it is five. When did they introduce Sondra?

A: It was established from the beginning that Cliff and Clair Huxtable had five children, according to a source with the show. However, daughter Sondra (Sabrina Le Beauf) was away at Princeton during most of the first and second seasons. In fact, she did not make her initial appearance on the series until two months into the first season when her character visited for Thanksgiving. Le Beauf did not become a series regular until the third season when her character graduated from college.

**Q:** Is Sara Gilbert of "Roseanne" related to Melissa Gilbert of "Little House on the Prairie"?

A: Yes, they are sisters who belong to quite a show business family. Their maternal grandfather, Harry Crane, created and wrote "The Honeymooners" and remains associated with various network programs. Their mother, Barbara, is a successful talent manager and producer. Melissa and brother Jonathan, of course, spent time on "Little House." Sara previously has appeared in the films "The Apple Dumpling Gang" and "Calamity Jane."

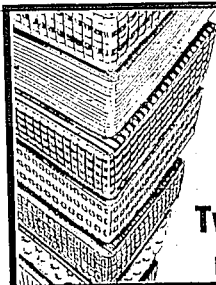

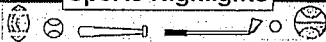



# ABC seeking the 'uncounted army' of television viewers

NEW YORK — In saloons, hotel rooms, second homes and college campuses, there is an uncounted army of network viewers whose numbers range between 4 million and 10 million, a senior ABC executive estimated Tuesday. And they should be included in national audience estimates, added Richard Montesano, ABC vice president for market research.

It could happen "within two to three years," he said at a news conference where ABC showed results of studies it and other companies have made on "out-of-home" network viewers not tallied by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

Among other things, one national ABC survey of 418 bars or restaurants with bars on Oct. 24 indicated that 2.8 million more viewers in such watering holes saw a "Monday Night Football" telecast of a San Francisco-Chicago game than were tallied in national Nielsens.

The ratings company has about 5,000 viewer-activated "people meters" in homes around the

United States. However, it does not include in its viewer count those in bars, hotel rooms, second homes and college campuses.

Cable TV, videotape players and independent TV stations now are contributing to the decline of network audience shares, which eight years ago peaked at 90 percent and are expected to be in the mid-60 percent range in the next decade.

As Alan Wurtzel, ABC senior research vice president, put it in a statement Tuesday, new technologies and changing lifestyles mean that "we in the television industry can no longer ignore the considerable, uncounted audiences at out-of-home locations."

Findings from a variety of ABC viewer studies, some made as far back as 1980, asserted that:

—There was a college campus audience in 1987 that, had it been added to the ratings for NBC's "Late Night With David Letterman," would have increased viewers aged 18 to 24 by 33 percent.

—Uncounted, out-of-home viewing of regularly scheduled sports

events on the three major networks in 1987 amounted to a 6.3 percent larger audience than was recorded. An additional 1.4 percent viewers would have been added to the Big Three's prime-time entertainment shows by counting out-of-home viewers.

—The uncounted hotel audience for early-morning network news programs on Oct. 24-25, 1988, would have boosted the programs' national audience by 3.5 percent — or 56,000 more viewers — had that audience been included in the national Nielsens.

Montesano, chairman of a committee on out-of-home-viewing sponsored by an industry group, the Advertising Research Foundation, said that he did not know how much more revenue could be yielded for the networks if existence of a substantial uncounted audience could be documented. But "once it is a rating, it will be part of the buying and selling process," he said.

The goal of all three networks is to get the uncounted, he said.

## Recent Medicare changes mean increased taxes for seniors

WASHINGTON—While President Reagan's signing of the Medicare Catastrophic Loss Protection Act last July will provide additional health coverage, it also will mean more in taxes for the approximately 32 million Medicare enrollees. The increased benefits will be funded by a surtax levied against all "Medicare-eligible" individuals whose tax liability exceeds \$150. Generally, this means anyone who is 65 or older and entitled to receive Medicare benefits—whether or not they actually receive or apply for them. Called a "sup-

An example of how the new supplemental Medicare premium will be applied: A 65-year-old taxpayer who has a federal income tax liability of \$4500 would pay an additional \$675 in 1989 ( $4500 \div 150 \times 22.50$ ).

plemental premium," this new surtax will begin in the 1989 tax year. It will amount to \$22.50 for every \$150 of federal income tax liability, with a ceiling of \$800 per person. By 1993, the premium will nearly double (see chart). The new surtax is based on the actual income tax paid, not one's taxable income.
