Judge bounces hospital budget back to county

TWIN FALLS — The county hospital's \$12 million budget amendment has been bounced from District Court back to the county commissioners.

Fifth District Judge Daniel Hurlbutt's ruling Thursday afternoon leaves a proposed cancer treatment center and other projects in limbo.

Hurlbutt denied the budget amendment, "for the reason that this court lacks jurisdic-

tion to grant the relief requested." But the amendment is not dead.

"It is not intended that this court's denial of the petition herein in any way change or prevent from any lawful action the Board of County Commissioners may take to resolve these budgetary problems," Hurlbutt's decision reads.

Kent Taylor, the hospital's legal counsel, said there are two more avenues for getting the amendment approved. State law allows the county commissioners to amend departmental budgets in emergencies, and it says

budgets can be adjusted to include "unscheduled revenue from federal and the state government."

What might happen next is unclear. All three county commissioners were at an out-of-town conference Thursday and could not be reached for comment.

Magie Valley Regional Medical Center administrators also were out of town. But Dr. Ben Katz, county Hospital Board chairman, said if the hospital isn't in an emergency, it isn't far from one.

"What's an emergency?" Katz asked.

"We're not bleeding. I don't know if you can say it's a life or death situation, but there are some dollar concerns."

He described the hospital's predicament as an "economic emergency."

He said the hospital has made down payments on several expensive pieces of equipment for the cancer treatment center, which is scheduled to open early next year. Delaying construction until the next budget year begins this fall would be expensive, he said.

The amendment covers the cancer center and other projects that hospital officials

have planned for some time but hadn't put in their regular budget. It also puts nearly \$20 million of hospital reserve funds into the budget for the first time.

Katz said delaying the cancer treatment center is not the only concern: Even without the expansion projects, hospital capital spending this year could top the existing budget's \$14 million limit, leaving the hospital strapped for cash to spend on normal equipment purchases.

The community risks losing a recently re-

Smoke-free air bill passes Senate

BOISE — A directive that Idaho employers provide workers with a smoke-free environment if possible has been approved by a sharply divided state Senate.



What sponsor Michael Crapo, R-Idaho Falls, called more a policy statement than a mandate was sent to the House on Thursday by a 21-17 vote.

"The air we breathe outside is cleaner than the air we breathe inside," Crapo said. "It's becoming a major source of health concern."

But the extension of the smoking ban in the Idaho Clean Indoor Air Act to the workplace drew bipartisan opposition from lawmakers, seeing it as nothing more than another government incursion into the operations of the private business sector.

"This is an infringement on the employers' and employees' rights to negotiate that issue of the workplace," Sen. Marguerite McLaughlin, D-Orofino, said.

Under the bill, employers must to the extent possible ensure a smoke-free environment to workers seeking

one. It also allows employers to declare their entire work areas smoke-free.

Crapo and others maintained that medical and scientific evidence abounds to show that second-hand, or side-stream, smoke has adverse health effects on nonsmokers. Sen. Mike Blackbird, D-Kellogg, and Sen. Roger Madsen, R-Boise, both maintained sidestream smoke has increased "business" costs through lost productivity and increased worker absence.

But while opponents of the bill did not counterclaim that they argued that overregulation was not the answer.

"The new mood of environmental responsibility is not one of regulation," Democrat Mary Lou Reed of

AMA, others propose Medicaid overhaul

WASHINGTON — A coalition led by the American Medical Association on Thursday proposed a sweeping overhaul of the Medicaid program.

It would expand coverage to 11 million more poor Americans, improve benefits and raise reimbursement rates for physicians and hospitals.

The proposed expansion of the federal-state health assistance program for the poor would cost at least \$18.2 billion and as much as \$24 billion above current Medicaid expenditures, with most of the additional cost borne by the federal government, the coalition said.

In fiscal 1988, the federal government spent \$20.5 billion and the states spent \$20.5 billion on

Medicaid, but fewer than half of the 33 million Americans with incomes below the federal poverty line are enrolled in the program, the coalition said.

"We call for a system that truly cares for the needs of the poor," said James R. Tallon Jr., majority leader of the New York State Assembly and chairman of the coalition's committee on Medicaid.

To pay for the program, new revenues will have to be developed... This is going to cost the government more money," Tallon said.

The plan was proposed by the Health Policy Agenda for the American People, a coalition organized in 1982 by the AMA to help develop health policy. The AMA pays for most of the work of the coalition, which is comprised of 172 groups repre-

senting business, labor, consumers, the elderly, children and health-care providers.

A major problem with Medicaid, the coalition's report said, is the absence of national standards. Eligibility varies from state to state, so do many of the services Medicaid covers.

The federal government requires states to provide Medicaid coverage to those on state-managed public assistance, primarily Aid to Families with Dependent Children, for which states determine eligibility.

As health care costs have accelerated, states have contained their own Medicaid costs by restricting eligibility for AFDC programs, thus limiting the number of people covered and reducing state matching obligations.

Flight 103 fell to tape player bomb

LOCKERBIE, Scotland — Investigators probing the fatal Dec. 21 bombing of a New York-bound Pan American World Airways jumbo jet have concluded that the explosives were concealed in a radio-cassette player that was probably shipped onto the flight in Frankfurt.

"However, said Detective Chief Superintendent John Orr, who is the senior Scottish investigating officer, eight weeks into the inquiry there is still "insufficient evidence... to establish the identity of the person or

group responsible for this dreadful crime."

Orr spoke at a press conference in this village where the fiery wreckage of Pan Am Flight 103 smashed to earth, killing 11 residents. The bomb, which tore the plane apart at an altitude of 37,000 feet, also killed all 239 passengers and crew on board.

The fatal flight originated aboard a smaller aircraft in Frankfurt, then took on more passengers and switched to a Boeing 747 at London's Heathrow airport for the final leg to New York.

Rainmaking and meticulous examination of debris has now led to the conclusion that the explosive device was within a radio cassette player, Orr told reporters.

He declined to give any further information about the player except to say he has indications of the make and that the discovery may well point the continuing search for the perpetrators toward a specific country.

Reconstruction of a baggage container previously identified as the one in which the explosion occurred suggests that the explosive device may have been among the baggage from the Frankfurt flight, Orr added.

EPA limits use of Captan

WASHINGTON — The government Thursday curbed the use of a fungicide sprayed on a wide variety of fruits and vegetables — including potatoes — but stopped short of banning it outright although it has been classified as probably causing cancer.

In announcing the action, the Environmental Protection Agency said, "The benefits of some uses of Captan outweigh the risk from dietary exposure."

The agency said that in the cases where the chemical may continue to be used on certain food products the risk of a person getting cancer because of such exposure is less than one in one million.

Captan has been widely used as a fungicide for vegetables and fruits since the early 1950s. The EPA esti-

mated that about 10 million pounds of the chemical is used each year.

The EPA order prohibits the further use of Captan on 42 different food products, but allows continued use on 24 other food products including apples, peaches, cherries, lettuce, green onions and tomatoes.

The foods on which the chemical may no longer be used include cucumbers, broccoli, potatoes, oranges and pears.

The EPA, which began looking into the possible dangers of Captan in 1980, proposed in 1985 that the chemical be ordered off the market altogether because of its cancer risk.

But John Moore, EPA's acting deputy administrator, said that day studies since 1955 have shown the health risk to be less than once thought.



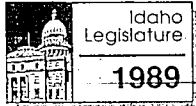
Tax cut clears Legislature

BOISE (AP) — A modest \$45 million personal income tax cut cleared the Idaho Legislature on Thursday as budget writers began work on their blueprint for state spending in the year that begins July 1.

With little debate and no hint of opposition, the Senate sent Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus the tax cut bill that translates into a maximum state income tax savings of \$8.20 for individual taxpayers and their dependents.

"This is probably the only tax relief bill you'll see around here this year," Senate Local Government and Taxation Committee Chairman Rachel Gilbert, R-Boise, told her colleagues.

The bill brings Idaho's income tax laws into conformity with the



surplus now estimated at over \$50 million.

"This is our chance to be heroes and give some money back to the people," Gilbert said.

But in making that gesture, the Legislature has further eroded the continuing revenue base budget writers have to work with in crafting a 1990 state budget.

The Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee on Thursday began working on that budget plan against the backdrop of Andrus' \$763.4 million spending strategy that makes substantial new investments in education and social programs.

Andrus tapped the surplus for over \$8 million and proposed a business tax increase of \$12 million to balance his budget.

Bonneville County fire district chief loses job

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Bruce Allcott, chief of the Bonneville County Fire District for almost five years, has been fired by the district's commissioners.

Wade Campbell, chairman of the three-member commission, said Thursday that the vote to fire Allcott was unanimous and took effect Monday after Allcott met with the commission's attorney.

Campbell declined further comment until expiration of a 10-day appeal period allowed for terminated employees under district procedures.

The other commissioners, Jack Vernon and Doyle Heyrend, referred questions to Campbell. Allcott has contacted an attorney and plans to file an appeal, which would be heard by the commission itself.

McClure looks for support for wilderness compromise

BOISE (AP) — Senior Republican Sen. James McClure has appealed to state lawmakers to support the Idaho wilderness compromise he and Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus fashioned 15 months ago.

"Perhaps I haven't said clearly enough that this problem that has been with us for 20 years must be solved," McClure told members of the House and Senate in remarks to both chambers on Thursday.

"It's a tough, contentious issue, but it needs to be resolved," he said.

McClure also warned lawmakers not to overreact in their zeal to fashion an independent program of environmental quality monitoring at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory to calm public concern about INEL's operations.

He suggested that intensifying environmental scrutiny of that federal defense and research facility to ensure it is not damaging water and air quality could backfire if the same scrutiny were applied to other industries like agriculture.

Director delivers message to inmates

BOISE (AP) — The new director of the Department of Corrections has a message to prison inmates. Correctional officers, not the inmates, will be in charge of prisons.

Staff too often become counter-punchers," said Richard Vernon, "I want to be pro-active, not reactive."

Being assured of control is important to Vernon. It will help curb disturbances that otherwise might flare into full-scale riots and also create a solid foundation, Vernon plans to use that foundation to launch self-help and educational programs.

Vernon spent much of his first day on the job Wednesday meeting with supervisors at the main state prison south of Boise. By late afternoon, he was seated behind his desk, white shirtsleeves rolled up, tie loosened.

Vernon, 58, is a veteran of prison programs in his native state of Washington. He makes it clear he considers himself an administrator, not a tough guy.

"I'm pretty low-key," he said. "I'm a manager, basically. I've got to get the work done through other people's efforts."

Vernon was lured out of retirement by the challenge of guiding the 560-employee agency and its \$20 million annual budget.

He succeeds Al Murphy, who was asked to resign amid allegations of secrecy. Already, Vernon has taken pains to set a different image.

He said he will have an open-door policy with the news media.

Washington's prison chief and ex-warden, was the unanimous pick of the Board of Corrections, out of 25 applicants.

Coeur d'Alene principal demoted to teaching position

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — Robert Olson, the Coeur d'Alene School District's longest-serving employee, has been demoted to a teaching position after 35 years as principal of Bryan School.

"The feeling here was sort of like when Mount St. Helens went off," parent David Gerber said Thursday.

The staff at Bryan was shocked by the decision, said Gerber, who is the school's parent-teacher organization representative.

Superintendent Merlin Ludwin notified the 63-year-old Olson on Wednesday that he would not be offered a position as principal next year.

Olson said he had not decided whether to accept the teaching position or retire.

"I'm mulling the options," he said. "I was planning to work one more year and retire when I was 65. I would have hoped that I would have been allowed to continue in my current position, unless I wasn't cutting the mustard."

British protest Khomeini orders to kill 'Satanic Verses' author

Britain protested to Iran on Thursday over Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini's orders to kill Salman Rushdie, the author of "The Satanic Verses," and religious students in Iran threatened suicide attacks on him.

The bounty for killing the Indian-born writer was doubled to \$5.2 million, and Britain's airlines — including British Airways — tightened security following bomb threats against some flights.

The death threats against Rushdie, whose

book has been denounced across the Muslim world as blasphemous, were called "appalling" by the U.S. State Department. A leading Islamic theologian who opposes the book said in Egypt that Khomeini erred by not giving Rushdie a chance to repent.

Rushdie, a naturalized British whose novel has sparked violent protests from Islamic fundamentalists, has canceled a promotional tour for the book in the United States and remains "in hiding with his American wife, Marianne Wiggins. Published reports said they were under police guard in Britain.

Muslims say the allegorical novel offended their faith by satirizing the prophet Mohammed as fallible; implying that Islam is not the only true religion; portraying Mohammed's wives as prostitutes; and suggesting he wrote the Koran, rather than receiving it from God.

The British Foreign Office summoned Iran's lone diplomat in Britain, told him Khomeini's threat was "totally unacceptable," demanded special protection for its Tehran Embassy, and froze plans to expand diplomatic relations with the Islamic state.

"We recognize that Muslims and others may have strong views about the contents of Mr. Rushdie's book," British Foreign Secretary Sir Geoffrey Howe said after his office summoned Iranian Charge d'Affaires Mohammed Badi.

"However, nobody has the right to incite people to violence on British soil or against British citizens. Ayatollah Khomeini's statement is totally unacceptable."

Howe stopped short of threatening to break diplomatic relations. But in an address to a Foreign Press Association luncheon he said "a stable and serious relationship... will not be possible while Iran fails to respect international standards of behavior."

Badi emerged from the Foreign Office in defiant mood, saying Rushdie's "infamous book" has had "appalling consequences in some Islamic countries."

"It is a decree, it is a verdict after careful consideration," he said of the death sentence. "It has nothing to do with any particular country."

Apartheid foes rebuke Mrs. Mandela

JOHANNESBURG — South Africa (AP) — Anti-apartheid leaders gave an unprecedented rebuke to Winnie Mandela on Thursday, saying she has betrayed the trust of the black community and kept bodyguards who waged a "reign of terror" in Soweto.

The influential activist accused Mrs. Mandela, wife of jailed African National Congress leader Nelson Mandela and once called the "Mother of the Nation," of "violating human rights ... in the name of the struggle against apartheid."

The strongly worded statement was the first public repudiation of Mrs. Mandela by the senior leadership of the anti-apartheid movement. They accused her of complicity in the abduction and assault of a 14-year-old black activist, Stompie Sepele, whose decomposed body was found dumped in Soweto last month.

Mrs. Mandela, in the few public statements she has made, denied she was at home when the teenager and four men were abducted to her house on Dec. 29 by members of a so-called secession team known as Mandela United who act as her unofficial bodyguards. But

she has defended the abduction, saying the four were taken to protect them from sexual abuse at a Methodist church residence where they were staying in Soweto.

The church has denied the charge, and the anti-apartheid leaders made their denunciation of Mrs. Mandela at the Central Methodist Church in Johannesburg.

Tom Sebina, a spokesman for the African National Congress, said from the organization's Lusaka, Zambia, headquarters that ANC leaders were concerned at reports linking Mrs. Mandela with the boy's death.

Asked if Mrs. Mandela was present when Stompie was abducted, Sebina said: "Everybody at home believes so."

The ANC has called on Mrs. Mandela to disband the secession team.

Leaders of the banned United Democratic Front, the nation's largest opposition coalition, joined prominent anti-apartheid lawyers and officials of the Congress of South African Trade Unions, the largest black labor federation, in reaffirming their allegiance to Mandela while distancing themselves from his wife.

Solidarity step nearer legalization

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — Negotiators agreed in principle Thursday to amend the nation's labor law so that the banned Solidarity union could be registered immediately — if an accord is reached on other political and economic reforms.

The announcement, which appeared to satisfy Solidarity's demands for quick reinstatement, followed a meeting of a working group devoted to trade unions — part of broad negotiations between officials and the opposition.

"That's a lot. That's a lot. That's great," Solidarity leader Lech Walesa said by telephone from his home in Gdansk, after the agreement was described to him by a reporter.

The Communist Party made the political decision to make Solidarity legal again during a hotly contested Central Committee meeting last month. The working group decided the union could be registered nationwide in one step, under an amended labor law to be passed by the Sejm, or parliament.

Government spokesmen have said since the talks began Feb. 6 that legalization of Solidarity must be part of a "package deal" with the opposition.

American Marine colonel abducted year ago Higgins still alive, Shiite says

TYRE, Lebanon (AP) — A Shiite Muslim leader said U.S. Marine Lt. Col. William R. Higgins, abducted a year ago Friday while serving as a U.N. observer, is alive despite his captors' statement that he was sentenced to death as a spy.

"He'll be released eventually" by the pro-Iranian Shiite extremists who seized him, said Abdul Majid Saleh, political officer of the Amal militia in this ancient port 50 miles south of Beirut.

Higgins, from Danville, Ky., commanded a 76-man U.N. observer group monitoring the Lebanon-Israel border. He was kidnapped by gunmen who stopped his car, 20 minutes after he had met with Col. Saleh, on the highway south of Tyre.

Saleh would not say how he knew Higgins had not been killed by the Organization of the Oppressed on Earth, which claimed responsibility for the abduction.

His militia claims to have undercover agents who track hostage developments. The moderate Shiite movement, backed by Syria, opposes the pro-Iranian fundamentalist Shites who hold most of the 15 Westerners missing in Lebanon.

Militia officials and other sources interviewed in south Lebanon shed new light on Higgins' abduction near Tyre on Feb. 17, 1988. His 44th birthday was Jan. 19.

A security source told The Associated Press that members of Amal tried to rescue Higgins three days after

he was kidnapped, but were overwhelmed by Hezbollah gunmen in the village of Jibchek.

No independent confirmation of the report was available, but Amal did make a considerable effort to find Higgins. Angered that he was kidnapped in territory it considered its turf, the militia launched a dragnet and rounded up scores of Hezbollah activists.

Nine of the foreign captives in Lebanon are Americans, including Terry A. Anderson, 41, who has been held the longest. Anderson, chief Middle East correspondent for The Associated Press, was kidnapped March 16, 1985.

Higgins' unit was attached to the U.N. Interim Force in Lebanon.

Hirohito rites most expensive state funeral

TOKYO (AP) — Emperor Hirohito's state funeral may be the biggest in modern times, a Foreign Ministry official said Thursday.

Japan expects representatives of 151 countries to attend the Feb. 24 rites, led by President Bush and including 51 other heads of state and many more royals, vice presidents, prime ministers and foreign ministers, according to a senior official, who spoke on condition he not be identified.

The funeral is budgeted at \$74 million, including \$25.4 million to be spent on the funeral site, where there will be a sanctuary and two huge tents to shelter 10,000 dignitaries, \$19 million for security and \$21 million to build a mausoleum.

The Japanese press called it the most expensive state funeral in history.

Soon after Hirohito died of cancer at the age of 87 on Jan. 7, the government notified all 163 countries with which Japan has relations that they were welcome to send delegations to the funeral.

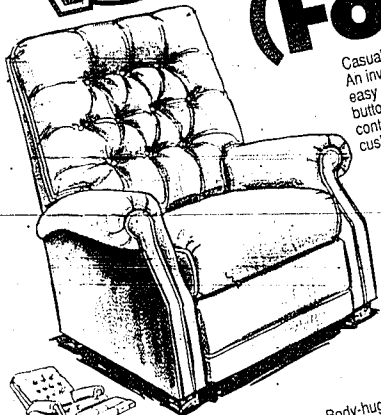

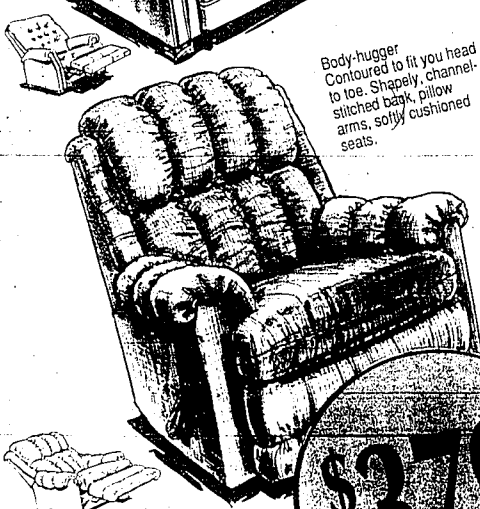

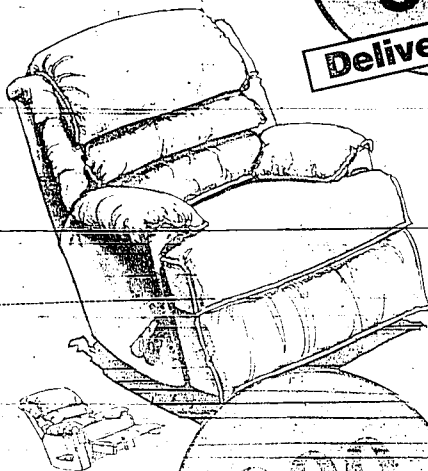

Committee defeats proposal to create county justice funds

BOISE (AP) — Idaho's counties say they need some help to fund operations out of their control — such as providing county jail space and paying for expensive trials.

But the House Revenue and Taxation Committee on Thursday declined to pass legislation the county officials say they desperately need.

The vote was 9-9 on legislation allowing creation of county justice funds, separate property taxing authority to fund such things as the courts, sheriff's offices, jails and prosecutors. Under legislative rules, the proposal died because it did not get a majority.

After the vote, Rev and Tax Chairmen Steve Antone, R-Rupert, announced he was holding a companion measure. It would have allowed counties to levy a surcharge up to 20 percent on drunken driving convictions to fund juvenile detention facilities.

Voting against the county justice proposal, all Republicans, were representatives Phil Childers, Golden Island, Cyril Burt, Coeur d'Alene, Con Mahoney, Mary Hartung, Mike Simpson, Stan Hawkins and Boyd Hill.



The committee's four Democrats and Republicans Antone, Gary Robbins, Don Loveland, Jerry Deckard and Reed Hanson voted for it.

In two days of testimony, county officials and sheriffs crowded the hearing room in quest of more funding authority.

The officials said with Legislature-imposed restrictions on property taxes, they simply can't fund the operations they are required to provide with the revenue available.

The officials estimated setting up a separate county justice fund, with its own property tax levy, would add about \$5.2 million to the statewide property tax bill.

But Andy Anderson, lobbyist for Associated Taxpayers of Idaho, claimed it actually would be a \$65 million tax increase. The county officials said if some operations were shifted to a separate county justice

fund, the tax levy for current operations could be reduced.

But Anderson said history indicates there would be no reduction and county officials simply would use the extra money elsewhere.

"Where the money is available, there is a tendency to spend it," said Burt, R-St. Anthony.

Dolores "Dee" Lawless, speaking for the Kootenai County Property Owners Association, urged legislators to remember that many people are on fixed incomes or don't make much. It would be "very unjust" to allow county commissions to raise property taxes without a direct vote of the people, she said.

Mark Dunham, lobbying for the Idaho Association of Realtors, said the association is concerned about the additional property taxes. At least, he said, the people should be able to vote on it.

But Canyon County Commissioner Glen Koch said you can't let people vote on whether they want to pay for certain governmental operations. People wouldn't want to pay for a jail, he said, yet the county has no option except to operate one.

University projects receive grants

BOISE (AP) — What do nuclear reactions, particle guns and algebraic geometry have in common with cowbird calls, 18th century British sermons and religious life in the Spanish Netherlands?

They all are subjects of research projects at Idaho universities that won grants from the state Board of Education on Thursday.

The board approved distribution of \$628,958 for 22 special research projects and another \$104,251 for five projects funded through matching grants. The special projects were selected from among 103 proposals submitted.

The money is from the \$2 million appropriated for research by higher education in fiscal 1989 by the 1988

Legislature.
Nine projects at the University of Idaho received a total of \$279,275. Five projects at Boise State University received \$107,374, seven at Idaho State University received \$216,682, and one at Lewis-Clark State College received \$25,627.

Among the high-science projects financed was a study at Idaho State on using nuclear reaction analysis for detection and depth-profiling of tritium in solids, and research on using particle guns to deliver foreign genes into cells or tissues.

Report fuels discussion of conflict of interest

BOISE (AP) — What began with a consultant's report to the state Board of Education on technology transfer at the University of Idaho turned into a heated discussion on possible conflicts of interest in commercializing research at the school.

Joseph Parkinson, chairman and chief executive officer of Micon Technology Inc. in Boise, complained bitterly to the board Thursday about the purchase of rights to some "very valuable patents" by a company partly owned by the president of the Idaho Research Foundation Inc.

Parkinson said the inside nature of the relationship runs counter to what should be the policy of a publicly funded university.

"If these patents had been commercialized or delivered out into the public on a public bid basis, I would have had no problem with that," he said. "I don't know that Micon would have been the logical bidder. I'm just saying that there are other logical bidders out there."

The university or the Board of Education could cancel its contract with the Research Foundation at any time.

CSI stages Neil Simon's 'The Good Doctor'

Master of dramatic comedy weaves a tapestry of Anton Chekhov stories

TWIN FALLS — From pathos to humor, the emotions of a 19th century writer will strike a resounding chord in contemporary audiences when the College of Southern Idaho's drama department presents "The Good Doctor" next week.

Billed as an irresistible blend of slapstick comedy and gentle charm, the two-act play written by Neil Simon consists of nine mini-scenes based on stories by Anton Chekhov, the famous Russian playwright. In his adaptation of Chekhov's work, Simon weaves the sketches together through a narrator — the Good Doctor — played by Derrick Hanson.

Performances will be given at 8:15 p.m. four days, Wednesday through Feb. 25, in Room 119 of the college's Fine Arts Center under the direction of Dr. Fran Tanner.

The title of the comedy reflects a shared interest of both playwrights, in addition to the compulsion to write, Tanner says.

Simon, considered one of America's most popular and enduring contemporary dramatists, has a childhood nickname of "Doc," which was given to him after he fell in love with an uncle's present of a toy stethoscope. The young Simon insisted on using it on all adults who visited his family.

And Chekhov, a practicing physician most of his life, was called "the good doctor" by a biographer. The Russian doctor, who died of tuberculosis at age 44, just as he had achieved recognition, wrote hundreds of short stories, but earned lasting literary fame for some half dozen plays.

The nine CSI actors each portray several characters with professional skill. The elaborate period costuming and careful attention to lighting effects all contribute to an evening of theatrical pleasure.

"It's fun for the cast because they can take several roles," Tanner says.

Tony Mannen, associate professor of speech at CSI, serves not only as technical director but has a role in "The Audition," which draws from "The Three Sisters," one of the best known of Chekhov's plays.

In addition to Hanson, other students in the cast include Keith Owen, Kelly Ramirez,

The young actors obviously relish their portrayals of human situations that, while set in pre-revolutionary Russia, evoke the same emotions today.

The fear of going to the dentist, for example, is still with us, Mannen points out, even though techniques and equipment have changed tremendously. So current audiences can appreciate the peasant's trauma in "Surgery" as the dental assistant tries with disastrous results to extract his tooth.

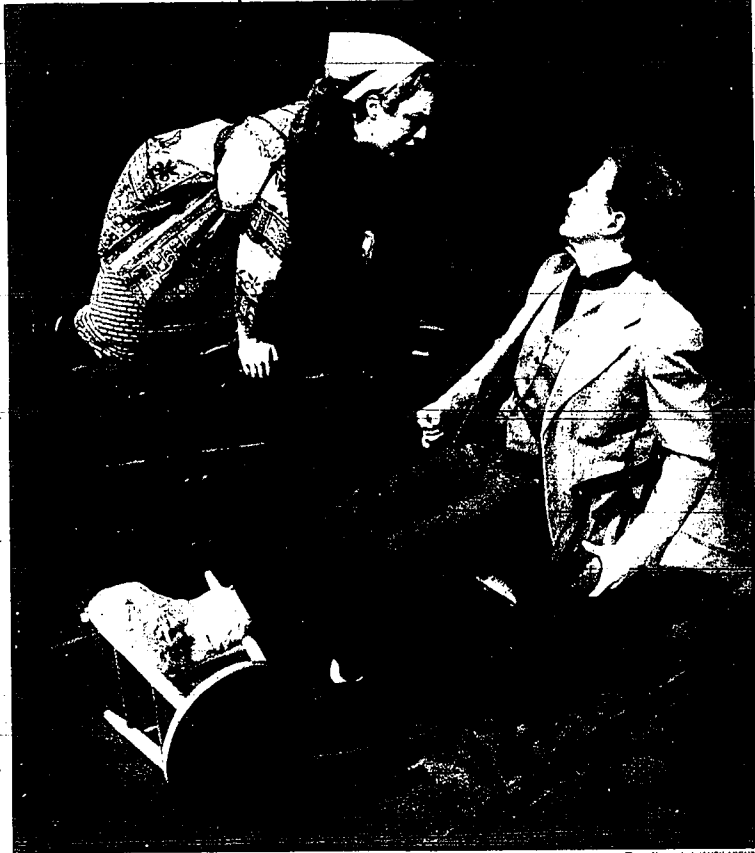
One of the most hilarious of the scenes, "A Defenseless Creature," pits the earthy wiles of a voluptuous, demanding wife against the outraged defenses of a banker suffering from gout. She tries to wrangle money out of the banker. And as she intimated, the overwrought wife gets her loan so the banker can get rid of her.

Even in the ridiculous "Drowned Man," we see the good doctor losing his original horror when a ragamuffin wants to entertain him by drowning himself — for a price, of course. Reforming the incident to the police, the doctor is informed the man is overcharging him and soon is intrigued with hugging over the price.

"It's like after-Christmas shoppers," Mannen says. "They may not need the item but can't pass up a bargain."

The comedy is Simon's 13th play and al-

'Encyclopedia Brown' creator Sobol remains a kid at heart

TWIN FALLS — If Encyclopedia Brown is the boy author Donald J. Sobol wanted to be, then is Sobol the grown-up Encyclopedia Brown would have become?

Ten-year-old detective Brown — known as Leroy to his parents — would pause a few moments, so people wouldn't think he was too smart, and then probably say "no way." After 25 years of being a 10-year-old boy, Encyclopedia Brown is never going to grow up. Just ask the 64-year-old Sobol.

On Saturday the author will be at Jud's Bookstore in Twin Falls from 1-4 p.m. to help celebrate the 10th birthday of the paperback publication of the Encyclopedia Brown series by Bantam Books.

Sobol submitted his first Encyclopedia Brown manuscript 27 times before he could find a publisher. Twenty-six years later, Encyclopedia Brown has become a beloved character in children's literature.

Encyclopedia — Brown — mystery books typically have 10 short cases along with the clues and solutions used by the enterprising 10-year-old sleuth.

Encyclopedia's sidekick is the two-footed and -brained Sally who keeps the tough kids from punching out Encyclopedia Brown and she's the only one in elementary school who can flatten the perennial villain Bugs Meany," the author says.

Sobol is not Encyclopedia Brown, but he would have liked to have been. "I suppose the kid that is still inside of me helps a great deal in shaping his character." He adds that he is probably more like Bugs Meany the bully, than like Encyclopedia. "I was always thinking of mis-

chievous things, but I didn't have Bugs courage to implement them," Sobol says.

Because of his great respect for his parents Sobol says he "couldn't think of anything that I would have desired less than bringing disgrace on my parents." He named the fictional town where "Encyclopedia Brown lives," "Idaho," after his own mother, Ida.

Sobol wrote his first Brown mystery, titled "Encyclopedia Brown, Boy Detective," in about two weeks. However the 17 books in the series since the 1983 publication — including an unnamed and still-to-be-published book — have taken about six months each.

He receives about 2,000 letters from children every year. Sobol also receives about 10 manuscripts, written by children who want him to publish them up. He says he reads them all and then returns the manuscripts to their authors.

questions about the boy detective and about Sobol, himself.

"The letters are delightful and endearing. I love them," says Sobol, who answers each one.

In anticipation of a Sobol interview, the Times-News asked fifth graders in Lori Hazen's and Edna Kulkow's classes at Lincoln School what questions they had for Encyclopedia Brown and his creator. Here's what the kids wanted to know:

Why is Encyclopedia Brown so smart?

It was in his genes, Sobol says. "His mother was a school teacher and she was very bright." That intellect has helped Encyclopedia solve about 195 mysteries.

Why did Sobol choose the name Encyclopedia?

"I wanted a name that a youngster would recognize right away so that he would know the book is about a very smart child," says Sobol.

He also considered using the word dictionary and last names such as Jones and Smith, but "to my ears Encyclopedia Brown seemed the best."

Even though Encyclopedia is very smart, Sobol took care to assure the boy didn't veer on the indestructible Batman or Superman. Instead, Sobol endowed Encyclopedia with a certain reluctance to get his nose bloodied. "Not that he was a coward," Sobol says. "But... he was a pacifist," hence the need for the tomboy, Sally. Sobol admits he anticipated negative reaction to Sally's tough character from his editors but never heard any opposition.

With good humor Sobol also answers a fifth grader's bold query: "How big is your nose?"

"It's 1 and 1/2 inches long and 'getting longer the older I get,' he says. •See SOBOL on Page D3

Big studios dominate Oscars

HOLLYWOOD — Big studios are riding high again; independents are having a lean year — after their bravura showing two years ago, and as a body, the membership of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences is proving to be ever-so-slightly eclectic and occasionally even audacious. Those are the messages to be found buried among the pages of lists for the 61st annual awards nominations.

It is interesting that the directors' branch of the academy singled out Martin Scorsese for "The Last Temptation of Christ," its one deviation from the Directors Guild slate of nominations. (The guild's choice was Robert Zemeckis for "Who Framed Roger Rabbit.") It is the one maverick vision of the list.

That may not exactly make Clint Eastwood's day, nor those of any of the fans of "Bird," shut out except for one nomination for its sound. It may disappoint those die-hard who pulled for Francis Coppola and Fucker against all odds, including the inability to see the movie again at pre-nomination time. The list of best director nominees still feels flimsy and unsub-

stantial without the presence of either "The Accidental Tourist" or "The Unbearable Lightness of Being."

You can find little pockets of delight tucked away in many of the categories: the nomination, for example, of Edward James Olmos for his beautifully shaded and unsparring portrait of a charismatic mathematics teacher in "Stand and Deliver." Or young River Phoenix's showing among the supporting actors. Or the fact that the voters did take six hours to see "Little Dorrit" and nominate both Alec Guinness' towering performance in the supporting actor category and its director Christine Edzard's keenly intelligent screenplay adaptation. Or the presence of Marcel Ophüls' "Hotel Terminus: The Life and Times of Klaus Barbie" among the documentary features a sign that length poses no barrier to the members of that nominating committee, either.

Those who complain that the academy is creamy and reverential should take a look at the fresh faces in the supporting actress category: Joan Cusack, Geena Davis, Frances McDormand, Michelle Pfeiffer and Sigourney Weaver, the first nomination for each (actually, the first and second for Weaver, who was

Allure of tap dancing returns with movie, festivals, shows

NEW YORK — In the jazz age, tap was queen to jazz's king, and then the unique dance form quietly slipped away.

But it's back now, in sizzling staccato style, the pounding rush of rhythmic feet — the energy and excitement of tap.

Tap dancing is big, as evidenced by the new movie, "Tap," the Broadway show "Black and Blue" and the rash of tap festivals around the nation.

"Tap is the first non-documentary movie about tap dancing in decades. It stars Gregory Hines, tap's most visible practitioner and booster, who also tapped in the 1930s movie, "White Nights" with ballet star Mikhail Baryshnikov.

"Black and Blue," a revue featuring tap dance, opened on Broadway in January with three singers and 21 dancers. Five are veteran hoofers, the eldest 79. There also is a trio of youngsters, including the wunderkind Savion Glover, who also co-stars in "Tap."

Last year tap festivals were held in Boulder, Colo., Boston and San Francisco, and more are scheduled for later this year in Portland, Ore., Houston and Washington. There's also been a resurgence in tap dance classes, which actively are competing with aerobics and dance-exercise

classes for students.

In January, the Jazz Tap Ensemble performed Mifson Gould's "Tap Dance Concerto" with the Minnesota Orchestra.

And if House Joint Resolution 662 passes, then May 25 will be National Tap Dance Day. It marks the anniversary of the 11th birthday of one of the greatest tappers of all time, Bill "Bojangles" Robinson.

The Four Step Brothers were given a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame last July, and the Young Step Brothers from St. Louis did some flashy dancing to celebrate it. Honi Coles won the Capoeira Dance Award in 1988, a first for a tapper. And on March 17, PBS "Great Performances: Dance in America" will present an hour devoted to tap dancing — another first.

Sammy Davis Jr. and the 71-year-old Sandman Sims co-star in "Tap" along with some other wonderful old-timers who recall vaudeville, the Cotton Club, 1940s Hollywood musicals and Broadway before ballet choreographers moved in and changed show dancing. They also remembered popular music before the big bands faded and rock and disco became too loud to hear the tapping of talented shows. But "Tap" isn't nostalgia. Its storyline promotes one of Hines' pet contentions, that tap dancing can be an exciting, up-to-date art form. He taps to the music — and city sounds — of today.

"I can't fulfill all the work they give me. They all know me in Harlem. They can't walk out on the street without somebody showing me a time step," says Sims.

"There's a difference between tap dancers and hoofers," he said. "The Caponecys — a slang word used to mean AOK — seen in 'The Cotton Club' movie, were tappers, using heel and toe. Hoofers use the whole foot and take their sounds from what they hear around them, as Hines' character does in 'Tap.'

"I told Gregory, 'At the end of this movie, people will know the truth,'" Sims said.

He remembers growing up in the desert near the California-Mexico border and dancing on sand. When he went to New York he got a box and made his sound and reputation dancing in sand. It wasn't salt, as some have said. "Salt's too sticky. You can't get your feet to move in salt."

When he was 14, he hungered to dance, but had no money and spent most of his time peeping in the windows of a Los Angeles tap school.

"I got put in jail," Sims said. "I had to go to court to get loose. This is a true story. I told the judge I wasn't loitering. I like to see how they dance because I try to be a buck dancer. He told them to clear the chairs and desks away and to let him see what I did. I danced a little bit and he said, 'Case dismissed!'"

Soon after, Sims moved to New York. "If I saw a dancer, I'd challenge him. I didn't care who it was. The way to get known in New York was to be the best. That's what I strived to be. It has kept me going."

also nominated for best actress for "Gorillas in the Mist." You might have hoped for the equally fresh face of young Jodie May from "A World Apart" or Diane Venora of "Bird" or Miriam Margolyes from "Little Dorrit" or Kathy Baker from "Clean and Sober," but this is one of the categories with the largest list of serious also-rans.

On the matter of "Pelle the Conqueror's" appearance on the foreign-language film slate, there is no surmise at all; it is exactly the sort of

film that academy members date on the Life Is Hard and Then You Die genre. Far more bracing on that list is Pedro Almodovar's sly "Women on the Verge of a Nervous Breakdown;" Istvan Szabos Hanussen, third of his trilogy that began with Mephisto and arguably the best of the three; and Mira Nairs pungent portrait of the street kids of India, "Salama Bombay!"

A pair of really extraordinary scores seem to have been left by the wayside in the music nominations: Peter Gabriel's fine and innovative

work for "The Last Temptation of Christ" and Mark Isham's preternaturally haunting score for "The Moderns." On the brighter side, "Calling You" by Bob Telson was one of the original song nominations.

There is one reference point to use in considering this year's list: the presence of David Lean's restored "Lawrence of Arabia." You can hear more talk now about its freshness, its grandeur than any other single film. Which of this entire collection can you possibly imagine resurrected 27 years down the line?

The rewards of writing for children are mostly in reactions of the readership — the children themselves, says Sobel. Many ask him how they can become writers and Sobel tells them to read a lot.

"Reading is the other side of the coin to writing," says Sobel. Equally important is to have confidence in yourself. "Don't let anybody tell you you can't."

Sobel has written more than 50 books for children. There are currently seven million Encyclopedia Brown books in print and Sobel's stories have been translated into nine languages.

In recent years Sobel has started another series for teens titled "The Amazing Power of Asher Fine." The theme involves a teenager who re-

ceives the power to become the person he wants for 15 minutes.

The father of three grown children, Sobel lives with his wife Rose in Miami. He spends about 40 hours a week writing. That's down from the 100 hours a week he used to spend writing when he first began creating Encyclopedia Brown.

Sobel doesn't begin a mystery until he has a solution. He claims he is not a natural writer but does have plotting ability.

Even though Encyclopedia Brown will never grow up, his mysteries will keep growing. The 17th Brown book, "Encyclopedia Brown and the Case of the Treasure Hunt," was published this month by Bantam Skylark. Sobel says future Encyclopedia Brown books will follow at about one every three years.

though Record of the Year and Song of the Year are related categories, the latter specifically rewards the songwriter, while the former focuses on performance. From that angle, Chapman has the edge. Not only does "Fast Car" feature lyrics that are considerably more vivid and evocative than "Don't Worry" (or any of the other three nominating numbers), it is a model of musical elegance, making the most of its simple, memorable melody. No contest here.

RECORD OF THE YEAR: This, on the other hand, is a much tougher call. If it came down to a simple tie between "Fast Car" and "Don't Worry Be Happy," McFerrin would have the edge. If only on points; his inventive, multi-tracked vocal arrangement has just enough flesh and dazzle to win over the industry technophiles who comprise a big chunk of the academy constituency.

Unfortunately, the other nominees — Anita Baker's "Giving You the Best that I Got," Jackson's "Man in the Mirror," and Winwood's "Roll With It" — can't be written off so easily. Jackson, after a period of being treated like a pariah, is back in the industry's good graces, while Baker is a growing favorite. But Winwood is loved to an extent that is almost inexplicable. Expect "Don't Worry" to win, but don't be too surprised if "Roll With It" tumbles into an upset.

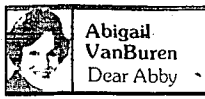
Would-be lawyer better give up after 44 tries at bar

Curl up with a good book

You've heard of comfort food; why not comfort books?

Winter, especially, is the time of year when we long for something to make us feel warm and content, like mashed potatoes, a cup of tea, or a good book.

My own favorite comfort book is anything by Barbara Pym, the wonderful British writer whose small, intimate world of curates and spinsters and thoroughly Madras English Millies is as inviting as tea and crumpets by a glowing fire.

Even Pym's heroines have a habit of reaching for a book to smooth over life's little troubles, as Mildred Lathbury does in "Excellent Women."

"Perhaps I was getting spinsterish and set in my ways, but I was irritated at having been woken. I stretched out my hand towards the little bookshelf where I kept cookery and devotional books, the most comforting bedside reading. My hand might have chosen 'Religio Medici,' but I was rather glad that it had picked out 'Chinese Cookery' and I was soon soothed in drowsiness."

There, feeling better?

In that warm-and-woolly spirit, here are some suggestions for books that will make the season's long win-

ter nights pass most luxuriously.

THE JANE AUSTEN SET

No one does Jane Austen better than Jane Austen (except, perhaps, George Eliot in "Middlemarch"), but the thread of the rich love-and-marriage Austen tradition runs throughout literature, right up to contemporaries such as Anita Brookner and Anne Tyler.

In Austen, we usually are given a high-spirited but wrong-headed heroine who does just about everything in her power to scare off the man she truly loves, and the pleasure comes in the biting social commentary and our knowledge that, eventually, love will triumph. Of course each member of the Austen set has her own endearing sense and sensibility: Barbara Pym's excellent women will seldom marry; Anita Brookner's loner heroines will fail to make vital connections; Anne Tyler's Baltimore women will humble their way, perhaps, to deeper understanding of their husbands and themselves.

My recommendations for best comfort books by the Austen set are: Emma by Austen; Middlemarch; Excellent Women by Barbara Pym; "Hazel de Lac" by Brookner; and "Breathing Lessons" by Tyler. But any novel by any of these writers will do very nicely.

Robin Williams walks a comedic fine line

NEW YORK (AP) — Robin Williams traverses the country, ridiculing Republicans. Ronald Reagan is "the world's largest Muppet." Dan Quayle is "the Steppord candidate." George Bush is a political hypnotist: "Thousands points of light, watch de watch."

People laugh. They reward Williams with ovations. And they elect Bush.

"I don't know, I can't understand it," Williams said, in a recent interview. "Bush still got elected. ... It was like, 'What? Wait a minute, why?' I kept doing joke after joke, firing Quayle is too easy. I mean, it's like shooting bullets into a dead horse."

He intends to keep on firing — at such targets as the Supreme Court (some of what you see is trying to write the Constitution on an Etch-A-Sketch) and the imperial presidency (there is an effort to "turn Congress into this kind of benign boys club. They pass a law, and it's like ... 'What laws? We don't need no stinkin' laws.'")

The jokes keep coming, but there is an underlying seriousness to Robin Williams' wacky world. One measure is the political material that has been incorporated in his act in recent years; another is the charity benefits in which he participates.

Next month he will appear on the third-annual HBO "Comic Relief" to raise money for the homeless; on Feb. 6, he appeared at a New York benefit to raise money for housing and for medical vans to treat homeless children, a project sponsored by singer Paul Simon. Tables for that show at the Shorston Centre sold from \$10,000 to \$25,000. That kind of ticket puts a lot of pressure on a performer.

You know the chicken's not what they're paying for," he said.

Williams, 38, is coming off his biggest screen success, "Good Morning, Vietnam," in which he portrayed an irreverent Saigon draftee. He's just completed work on a new film, "The Dead Poets Society," about a teacher at a private boys school in the 1950s.

But it was Williams' artistry as a

stand-up comic that launched his career and made him an enormous success.

He's much in demand on the benefit circuit. His main charities involve AIDS and the homeless, and he finds himself turning down worthy causes.

"The problem is you don't want to end up being like someone who would go to the opening of an envelope," he said.

"You diminish your power; you also diminish your ability to help the cause if you start doing every cause. Then people go, 'Oh, it's him.' There was a time when I did do every benefit. Save the Shrimp" — he's there! "People, people, listen — cocktail sauce is a horrible fate, people!"

He tries to find out as much as he can about his causes and candidates. "You better know about it, or you'll get creamed. They'll start asking, 'Do you know his stand on the basic budget deficit?'"

In a child's voice: "No. He's a nice guy though. Drives a good car."

He picks his causes from "gut feeling" and experience. He has watched

The Fly II proves a ponderous sequel

HOLLYWOOD — That The Fly II is not called Son of the Fly typifies the earnestness with which this lame sequel to the 1986 smash attempts to get a serious tone. But it is Son of the Fly and just might have been more entertaining had its makers owned up to that.

As it is, the film becomes faintly silly in its dogged seriousness, then slides into tedious and trite mess.

Essentially a bare-bones replay of The Fly, it more closely resembles countless other routine sci-fi horror pictures. So much dogged determination, plus considerable technical flourish, has gone into the inking of The Fly II that it cannot be said to

be truly terrible, merely ponderous and uninspired.

If you saw the poignant and oddly poetic 1986 film, you will recall that Dr. Seth Brundle (Jeff Goldblum) inadvertently mixed his molecules with those of a common housefly

during an experiment in the transmission of matter. Now we are told that his girlfriend was pregnant and, as the sequel opens, she is giving birth at an industrial complex whose owner (Lee Richardson) holds the rights to Brundle's cursed Telepod device. The woman dies giving birth to a monstrous creature, but out of its entrails comes a perfectly formed baby boy.

That is not to say that the kid is exactly normal. He is incredibly brilliant, and his growth, carefully monitored at the complex, is so accelerated that by the time he is 5, he is played by the grown-up Eric Stoltz.

And then there are those still-dormant aberrant chromosomes.

It is easy to see what is coming; not helping matters is that there is nothing distinctive in the romance that develops between Stoltz and a young scientist at the lab (Daphne Zuniga). Richardson proves to be a stock megalomaniacal villain. Indeed, so much is so dull that the sheer nastiness of Richardson ballyhooing, dirty-minded head guard (Gary Clark) lives things up in welcome, albeit, pointless relief.

But then the entire film is really pointless. Writers Mick Garris, Jim and Ken Wheat and Frank Durabont have not been able to come up with a reason for making The Fly II beyond trying to cash in on the success of its predecessor.

This laboriously contrived film marks the directorial debut of Chris Walas, who won an Academy Award for his make-up effects for The Fly. Alas, not only is Walas better at making up actors than directing them but also he has gone overboard in sheer greediness to the extent that his mutants, rather than seeming scary, seem like creatures left over from the deliberately funny The Howling.

The Fly II (rated R for much repulsive gore, some sex) is a sleek, handsome production, featuring a portentous score and an elaborate sound design, but its makers better be braced for unintended laughter.

Box office revenues hit record level

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Movie box office revenues hit a record \$4.46 billion last year although theater attendance took a slight dip, the president of the Motion Picture Association of America told theater owners Tuesday.

In spite of competition for the eye and ear of the American consumer, in spite of an avalanche of visual options, the movie theater has not only refused to die, it has held firm. Jack Valent told the opening session of the SHOWEST convention.

Theater admissions totaled 1.085 billion in 1988, Valent said, the 12th consecutive year that attendance topped the one-billion mark. The attendance figure was down 0.03 percent but revenues were up 5 percent, he said.

Valent told theater owners they are in a "watching war," with 90 million TV households across America.

"In the last 10 years, there has grown a veritable new nation with 49 million homes wired to cable, 37 million pay cable subscriptions and only 19 million homes capable of receiving pay per view," he said. "There are over 56 million VCR

households and one out of five has more than one VCR.

"As alternate delivery systems invade the American living room, the conventional wisdom was and is 'the cinema is bound to die.'"

But the movie industry has held firm, Valent said.

The United States recorded a per capita movie theater attendance mark of 4.4 last year, compared to Great Britain with 1.4, Canada with 2.8, France and West Germany 1.9 and Italy 1.6.

Before his speech, Valent told reporters the industry was making headway in the fight against film piracy. He said random checks found about 10 percent of the videos in stores were pirated, down from an estimated 25 percent a few years ago.

"We're bringing it down to tolerable levels," Valent said. "We can never eliminate the problem."

Valent said the industry spends \$25 million a year in the anti-piracy hunt, a small fraction of the revenue the industry loses to pirates. He said at one time it lost \$200 million a year to piracy in Japan alone.

'Beaches' misses book's sensibilities, bad mouth

The following are capsule reviews of some of the films playing locally in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

BEACHES (PG-13). This adaptation of the novel by Iris Rainer Dart is supposed to be the story of an abiding friendship between two very different women. Bette Midler is inevitable casting for the novel's C.C. Bloom and there is everything right with the idea of Barbara Hershey as C.C.'s friend. But the movie is missing what the book had reams of: heart, connective tissue, sense, sensibilities, a good ear and a bad mouth.

HER ALIBI (PG). This mystery is certainly elegant looking, but 15 minutes into the action the thrill is gone and director Bruce Beresford seems to have no clue as to how to find it. Tom Selleck plays a mystery writer who has hit a writing block, so he hits a few real courtrooms, looking for inspiration. Czech-born actress-model Paulina Porizkova plays a "Romanian" mystery woman and before you can say jurisprudence, Selleck has lied gracefully, providing Porizkova with an alibi at her murder trial.

THE LAND BEFORE TIME 3: GAN (G). This animation feature stars Littlefoot, a baby Brontosaurus, who will lose his mother and must find his way without her to the Great Valley, or starve. Director Don Bluth has gone to the trouble of giving very little children a sort of primer of dinosaur lore. It is nice that the Lucas-Spielberg forces, who are the film's executive producers, are behind the idea of overcoming differences and pulling together — that the Stegosaurus can lie down with the Pterodactyl, so to speak. But do dinosaurs really lend themselves to certain cuteness?

MISSISSIPPI BURNING (R). It moves us to outrage and horror as it takes us back 24 years to the brave and dangerous doings of civil rights activism in Mississippi. Exquisite performances by Gene

Hackman as Southern ex-sheriff Anderson and William Dafoe, as his by-the-books but experienced superior, Ward. If you listen closely to the dialogue, it's clear that director Alan Parker's respect for this almost holy period of American struggle is what has expanded upon a pretty pedestrian script.

RAIN MAN (R). Because we have had dozens of buddy films about journeys-of-discovery, we can plot the scenario of this one like a road map: The special qualities of one will work on the other to change him, or perhaps both of them. Dustin Hoffman makes his autistic savant character hypnotically interesting and sometimes terribly funny. Tom Cruise gives his looser, most authoritative performance since "Risky Business" and it can be said unblushingly that he holds his own with the masterly Hoffman.

Charlton Heston plays Mafia don to keep his acting skills sharpened

By EVAN LEVINE

Although Charlton Heston has made more than 50 movies, some with titles like "Airport 1975" and "Earthquake," he will be forever identified with his larger-than-life performances in epics such as "Ben Hur" and "The Ten Commandments."

Now, Heston takes on another larger-than-life role portraying a Mafia don in "Original Sin" (NBC, Feb. 20). The movie co-stars Ann Jillian as a woman whose son (Zachary Benjamin) is kidnapped, presumably by her father-in-law (Heston).

Before the interview, we wonder what the actor will be like. Visions of Heston clad in white robes playing the Red Sea spring to mind. It turns out that we were not too far off: "Hang on a minute, I've just gotten out of the pool," he says when we telephone him at his home in California.

"I took this role (in 'Original Sin') because it was as far as I could get from Sir Thomas More," says Heston, referring to a recent cable remake of "A Man for All Seasons." "The actor always has to be on the character's side. I've played a few roles where the audience doesn't have to be, and

this is one of them."

What led Heston to take the role, he says, is an interest in playing parts "as far from my chemistry as an actor as I can. This guy is a contemporary of Al Pacino's character in 'The Godfather,' except in 1988."

Heston used Al Pacino's role in "The Godfather" and his own role as Cardinal Richelieu in "The Three Musketeers" to create the character. He also watched "The Godfather" to observe the older Mafia characters. "Other than that, I didn't need to do much to prepare," he says. "It wasn't like I needed to do historical research."

But the roles that required historical research are the ones that are best etched in viewers' minds. "There were only five or six of that genre; I can't help that a lot of people saw them," he says, anything but apologetically. "They've been buying my children's shoes for years."

And are those the films of which Heston is the most proud?

"You're proud of films for different reasons. Some, because they make a lot of money; some, because they win a lot of prizes; some, because they're challenging films. 'The Ten Commandments' was one of those. 'Ben Hur' wasn't; I essentially

played me. After all, there's no reason to assume he wasn't like me.

"There won't be any more films like that," he adds, citing spiraling costs. "A friend of mine in budgeting said to me, 'Chuck, do you know that 'Pee-wee's Big Adventure' cost more to make than 'Ben Hur'?"

"I'm proud of many things — I've done three Shakespearean films. 'Planet of the Apes' spawned a whole genre. I've been told that my best work was in 'Will Penny' and 'Khartoum.' They got good notices but were only modest successes."

And don't discount the idea of seeing Heston in a comedy. "I've done two, one of which didn't do too well," he says. "I'd like to do more comedy, but the problem is whatever scripts I get already have Jack Lemmon's or Walter Matthau's fingerprints on them. They've passed. That should tell you something about those scripts!"

In this case the candidate is Jesse Jackson, whose 1988 run for the Democratic presidential nomination certified his standing as a leader able to capture the nation's attention. His support may have been predominantly black, but everyone listened.

As this program shows, the biggest listeners of all may have been the media. Whether through intimidation or charm, Jackson has better understood and mastered the press than any other contemporary politician.

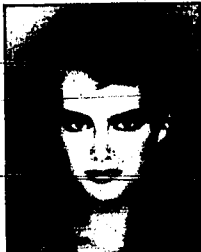
Brooke Shields helps alcoholics

Q: What's this we hear about New York superbuilder, Donald Trump taking up with gorgeous Hollywood actress Bo Derek? — F.B.

A: Talk about improbable couples! Trump is very much married to the svelte and energetic New York society hostess, Ivana Trump. Bo is still married to svenigall-director John Derek. Admits to red-hot temper

Gorbachev's number one love is the movies — and his favorite American film actor turns out to be Gary Cooper. Cooper's daughter Maria, hearing that Gorbachev had expressed a desire to see "Friendly Persuasion" and "Love in the Afternoon," presented prints of both to him when she and pianist-husband Byron Janis were in Moscow recently. The success of "A Forgotten Tune for the Flute," the Chuck Fries import from the U.S.S.R. starring Tatyana Dogleva, which teases Soviet bureaucracy, is probably due to Gorbachev's influence.

Q: What's this I hear about Max von Sydow playing a "wetback"? Somehow I can't see that tall, blond, elegant Swede playing such a role. — E.D.

A: And you'd be quite right — although there's no type-casting for von Sydow, who 25 years ago was Jesus in "The Greatest Story Ever Told," and who since then has portrayed German spies, Russian KGB agents, an exorcist and a German playwright, besides all his roles in those Ingmar Bergman classics. His latest role, which may win him an Oscar, is in "Pelle the Conqueror," in which he plays a poor farm laborer who migrates with his young son across the Baltic Sea to work in Denmark. Whether or not he wins this year's Academy Award, von Sydow is already hard at work on his next film, in which he will play a 16th-century pope. "I was brought up on the Swedish stage," says von Sydow. "You cannot specialize there. It's a small country with a small number of actors. You have to do it all."

McVicar's 'cad with a conscience' helps him develop his acting skills

With the plotlines heating up, "The Bold and the Beautiful" suddenly spurred in the January ratings. "Stories are tighter, more specific," declares Daniel McVicar, who plays Clarke — "a cad with a conscience."

Ambitious Clarke is probably one good reason for the ratings rise. The handsome devil gets Margo pregnant, only to turn around and marry Kristin, the sweet, naive Forrester daughter.

Originally, when the series was first gearing up to go on the air, McVicar tested for another role. Evidently Colorado's Daniel McVicar left an impression. In need of outside villainy, producer Bill Bell remembered McVicar's screen test way back when. And "The Bold and the Beautiful" got its new hustler.

As Daniel responded to the pushy Clarke, Bell tossed in more shady moves and quick explanations for the actor to build his character. Slowly Clarke became a combination of ruthless ambition and a search for redemption.

Then fate took over. When Lynn Koslow (Margo) became pregnant in real life, Bill Bell wrote it into the script. Clarke was wooing Kristin when Margo revealed he was to become a father.

"Now we had a real conflict going," noted the actor. "Kristin finds out the reason for the money, she learns about the fake housing deal and she sees me avoiding my son. I'm in deep trouble. Even my old boss Sally wants me to steal Forrester designs. Sally and I are in for quite a spring."

"Don't bet against Clarke," Daniel advises. "He thrives on making the most of adversity."

McVicar thrives on acting because it gives him "a heightened existence." A stint at London's Royal Academy of Drama changed his life. In Los Angeles for a decade, Daniel resigned himself that he was going to be a character man, but "The Bold and the Beautiful" pushed him into the leading man category.

Letterman to air with entire town

BOLAN, Iowa (AP) — March 1 will be a late night for this town.

Its residents — all 16 of them — will appear that evening as guests on the NBC-TV show "Late Night With David Letterman."

"If he's looking for American Gothic, I think he's going to be disappointed," said Daryl McCready. "We don't exactly have hats and pitchforks. We know what's going on in the world."

None of the residents of this northern Iowa town, which isn't even on some state maps, has ever been to New York. But most are at least vaguely familiar with the talk show host famous for his "Stupid Pet Tricks" routine and off-beat humor.

"His show is on too late for us, although we did all get together and watch his seventh anniversary special," said 73-year-old Ruth Hansen. "It was kind of interesting."

Loren Nydegger, a senior basketball player who attends high school at nearby St. Ansgar, said, "A lot of people are pretty excited about this."

"They joke about things like when they introduce the team at games, they'll say, 'And now, going to New York and being on the David Letterman show and also playing guard, Loren Nydegger,'" he said.

Jodi Ross, a talent researcher for the show, suggested Bolan after talent coordinator Madeleine Smithberg came up with the idea of inviting an entire town to be guests on the program.

"The thing is that there's a lot of little towns across the country and Bolan is just — from everything I've read about the town and everything I hear about it — they're just really

a special little community," Ms. Ross said.

Letterman, known for his sometimes sarcastic behavior with guests, will make Bolan residents feel special, she said. Raised in Indiana, he will get along fine with the Iowans.

"He's going to be taken with this whole thing. Of course, he's going to be Dave. He's going to joke around. But these people are to be celebrated because they're such wonderful folks and because, hey, the whole town came all the way to New York to be on our show," she said.

The Bolan residents will fly Feb. 28 to New York. The show will be taped the afternoon of March 1 and broadcast that night. The network is paying for round-trip air fare from Des Moines, two nights in a

hotel, meals and spending money.

"I just hope someone there will meet us at the airport. Could you imagine the headlines: 'Little town gets lost at airport,'" joked Linda Nydegger, Loren's mother.

The Letterman show isn't the first fame for the 103-year-old Worth County town located about 130 miles north of Des Moines.

It was host to 7,000 bicycle riders during a 1987 bike race, and it made national news during its centennial celebration when spectators walked around the town parade because the town is so small.

With all New York has to offer, what will the Iowans do during their stay?

Daryl McCready said he wants to visit the Statue of Liberty and the Empire State Building.

CBS wins with 'Lonesome Dove'

Monday night, those ornery critics at ABC and NBC kicked up just about as much dust as they're likely to this week but darn if CBS' "Lonesome Dove" didn't just ride off with another big win.

The second two hours of CBS' rawhide-tough miniseries landed a 23.8 national Nielsen rating and a 34 percent audience share after finishing tallest in the saddle Sunday night with a week-winning 28.5-42.

Monday night between 9 and 11 against Dove II, NBC lined up four Top Twenty sitcom regulars — "The Golden Girls," "Empty Nest," "Night Court" and "Cheers" — while ABC launched its new mystery series anthology with a fresh-out-of-the-mothballs "Columbo" episode.

While the comedy lineup was good for an 18.4-26 during the two hours and "Columbo" scored a respectable 16.3-23 around the country, the results still prompted cries of "tarnation!" from programming executives at both ABC and NBC, even though, altogether, the three networks attracted a very healthy 83 percent of the nets-in-use on Monday, as compared with the high-60s share the three have aver-

aged in recent weeks. Even if they didn't succeed in knocking off "Dove," NBC found a couple of things to crow about Monday night, when the special showing of "The Cosby Show" at 8 attracted the highest rating for the network (a 25.6) in that half hour since Feb. 16, 1981, when "Little House on the Prairie" was riding high. And the "ALF" episode at 8:30 (another part of NBC's "Night of a 1,000 Laughs" counter-programming strategy vs. "Dove") scored that series' best rating ever, a 22.8.

The last two nights of the eight-hour miniseries, which concludes Wednesday night, faced regularly scheduled fare on both ABC and NBC so the Monday night competition was as tough as it was going to get for CBS.

Before TV Column fans become totally benumbed by numbers this morning, we must tell you that researchers at the third-place network — who haven't had a lot to do beyond computing all-time lows so far this season — are beginning to dream Big Dreams again because of the two nights of "Dove" success.

You may recall that NBC started counting the 1988-89 season the week of Sept. 19, but CBS and ABC waited until late October, when

they both had something new to put on the air, before starting to count. According to NBC, CBS is just about out of it after 20 weeks, running seven-tenths of a rating point behind second-place ABC, which, in turn, is 3.1 points behind NBC.

But in the ABC-CBS count that began Oct. 24, CBS is 0.5 behind ABC (which is 2.7 behind NBC) and CBS Tuesday was giddy enough to dream that if "Dove" continues its 26+ rating pace over its last two nights, CBS could make up 40 percent of the difference with ABC and, in the words of research chief David Poltrack, "make the race (for second) interesting the rest of the season."

Poltrack points out that since the first of the year, CBS' regularly scheduled series are routinely running ahead of ABC's. Sure, CBS had the top-rated show but only six of its programs were included among the top 40 and that's why, despite the presence of "Lonesome Dove" at the pinnacle, the network finished in the basement for the week ending Feb. 5.

After all the smoke had cleared, the NBC juggernaut had nauted to its 20th straight weekly win this season with a 16.0 rating and a 25 share, compared with a 13.9-22 for ABC and a 13.6-21 for CBS.


