Tower debate focuses on credibility of witness

WASHINGTON — Senate Republicans, seeking to revive the founding nomination of John Tower as secretary of defense, Wednesday released evidence undermining the credibility of a witness who claims he saw Tower drunk and fondling women while touring Bergstrom Air Force Base in the 1970s.

According to information supplied to the Senate by Air Force officials, the nominee's

accuser — retired Technical Sgt. Robert Jackson — left the Air Force after being diagnosed as having "a mixed personality disorder with anti-social themes and hysterical

features." Moreover, the Air Force said, Jackson was not assigned to the Texas base in 1976 on the only occasion that Tower actually visited it.

Tower, who does not deny that he drank to excess during the 1970s, has characterized Jackson's account of his visit to Bergstrom as "a plain damn lie," according to an aide.

The controversial account of Tower's alleged misbehavior became a major issue in the opening day of floor debate on the nomination of the former Texas senator, who is likely to be the first initial Cabinet nominee of any president to be rejected by the Senate. Democrats, led by Senate Armed Services

Committee Chairman Sam Nunn, D-Ga., have argued that the evidence they have collected on Tower's excessive drinking and womanizing is based on "first-hand, personal observations by named individuals with no known motive to lie."

Nunn, who in an hour-long floor speech outlined why his committee voted 11-9 against Tower, said the FBI's extensive investigation found proof that Bush's nominee abused alcohol in the recent past, that he never sought treatment and that he has offered inconsistent versions of his drinking history since being nominated last Dec. 16. But Republicans argued that the unreli-

ability of Jackson's testimony supports their contention that much of the embarrassing information that the committee and the FBI have collected against Tower is — as Sen. Pete Wilson, R-Calif., put it — "garbage."

Although GOP senators have challenged Tower's Democratic critics to put their evidence against him on the record so the public can evaluate its credibility, Republicans nevertheless balked Wednesday when Sen. John Glenn, D-Ohio, characterized some of the FBI's secret evidence, Glenn quoted witnesses who reported seeing the nominee "drunk, inebriated, loud and garrulous" in 1983. Glenn's remarks were expunged from the

Senate record at the request of Republicans.

Likewise, Republicans were horrified when a story written by Washington Post investigative reporter Bob Woodward cited what until Wednesday had been secret testimony from the former Air Force sergeant. According to the story, Jackson described in vivid detail how Tower allegedly fondled two women — one a secretary and the other a female airman — while visiting the base on two occasions between 1976 and 1978. Woodward also quoted Jackson saying that Tower was "staggering" drunk.

More rain, snow-in prospect during winter's final weeks, weatherman-predicts

Storms top normal March moisture

TWIN FALLS — Don't let Thursday's rain fool you — winter is still with us.

The Magic Valley is in for a period of stormy, late-winter weather through the weekend, reports Bill Galkin of the National Weather Service in Kimberly.

Thursday afternoon, most places in the Magic Valley reported about 0.6 inch of rain. The normal for March is 0.76 inch, but that level was expected to be reached Thursday night.

A large low-pressure system is over the valley

with unusually low pressures — a phenomenon commonly associated with storms. The atmospheric pressure Thursday afternoon was 29.21 inches of mercury. The rain began turning to snow Thursday evening.

When the low pressure starts rising it will bring increasing wind. The forecast for Friday and the week end is for wind from 20 to 40 mph with poor visibility from blowing snow.

The weather for the next few days is expected to include wind, snow and rain in the lower valleys.

The Weather Service expects about one foot of new snow in surrounding mountains from

this storm.

Thursday afternoon, Pomerelle ski area reported 16 to 18 inches of new snow in the past 24 hours on top of 123 inches at the mountain top and still coming down. Sun Valley reported eight new inches on top of a 68-inch snow base on Bald Mountain and more coming.

The outlook for March calls for above-normal precipitation with below-normal temperatures, Galkin said.

Weather patterns look "favorable" for more precipitation following the present storm, said Scott Kaiser of the National Weather Service in Boise.

Senate approves \$394 million aid plan for schools

BOISE — An overwhelming bipartisan majority of the Idaho Senate on Thursday approved the 10.8 percent hike in state aid to public education that Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus once labeled deplorable.

"This bill is not 110 percent perfect," acknowledged Senate Republican Floor Leader Roger Fairchild of Fruitland. "But it's as close to the best thing we can do for education."


After two hours of debate and a narrowly defeated bid by Democrats to open the measure for modification, the Senate sent the \$394.3 million aid package to the House on a 32-10 vote.

Democrats, who continued to complain about provisions of the pivotal budget measure they claimed would restrict local school district control, conceded that public support for the measure was solid.

"People throughout the state, no doubt, are approving of the fact that we are appropriating this amount," said Sen. Marti Calabretta, D-Osborne. Other Democratic senators called the total financial commitment heartening and impressive.

"It shows our commitment to Idaho's children," Democrat Michael Burkett of Boise said. Burkett led the ill-fated effort to open the bill to amendment stripping restrictions on the use of some of the money. It failed on a 22-20 vote that saw only Sen. C.A. Smyser of Parma part company with the Republican majority in support changes.

The aid plan is \$700,000 higher

than the governor's recommendation — a promise GOP leaders made two months ago — and it is \$38.3 million above the current school allocation that Andrus called woefully inadequate when it was bulldozed into law by the Republican legislative majority last spring.

It is the largest increase in state support for schools in five years, continuing to account for over half the general tax money Idaho spends every year.

But Andrus initially criticized the 1990 aid bill because \$12 million of it is one-time money that cannot be guaranteed to the school districts beyond next year. In the past two weeks, however, he has softened his stand following public declarations from Republican legislative leaders that they were committed to continuing that level of support beyond next year.

Fairchild illustrated the impact of school aid on the state budget when he dumped \$10,000 in one-dollar bills on his chamber desk and divided the money into proportionate piles

Filer woman faces embezzlement charges

TWIN FALLS — Prosecutors charged a Filer woman late Thursday with embezzling more than \$6,000 from the United Way of Magic Valley.

The six felony counts charge Paula Bivens, a former United Way employee, with changing the amount on two of her paychecks and with pasting opaque labels on two donation checks so she could deposit the money to her husband's business account.

Thursday's action came after at least two months of investigation into the United Way embezzlement. Rockne Lammers, Twin Falls County's

chief deputy prosecutor, charged Bivens five minutes before the courthouse closed.

On two occasions, Bivens pasted an opaque label over the United Way endorsement on the back of a donation check, Lammers charges. On each label she typed the account number for her husband's business — Bimbo Bivens Quarter Horses — according to the complaint filed in 5th District Court.

Lammers charged Paula Bivens with one count of forgery and one count of grand theft for each check — one for \$2,130 and one for \$911. Lammers also charged her with two forgery counts for altering two paychecks to add \$100 to each.

Before Thursday's filing, United Way spokesman Fritz Wondrich had said at least one United Way

board member had expressed displeasure over how long the prosecutor's office was taking to file charges. But Wondrich declined to name the board member. United Way board members have consistently referred questions to Wondrich.

The alleged embezzlement was made public in mid-January, but the suspect was not named. City police submitted their investigation to prosecutors in early February. Lammers, who screened the case, said last week he had asked for more investigation.

"If I make a thorough, professional decision, what does it matter if I take a day, a week or a month?" Lammers said in response to a Times-News inquiry. • See EMBEZZLE on Page A2

American-Soviet team to trek Bering Strait area

ANADYR, U.S.S.R. — A 60-day, 1,200-mile trek and dog sled trek from Siberia to Alaska will be more elaborate than exploration for a dozen U.S. and Soviet adventurers setting out this weekend.

Aside from old weather research, the primary object of the Bering Bridge Expedition across seldom-visited sections of the Soviet Far East and arctic Alaska is good will, said Paul Schurke, 33, of Ely, Minn., who describes the trip as adventure diplomacy.

My pocket is full of cross-flagged (U.S.-Soviet) pins, Schurke said. We'll be leaving a full-sized

American flag in each Soviet village; a Soviet flag in each Alaska village.

The expedition is an attempt to call attention to the common cultural heritage of the indigenous population of the Bering region, Schurke said.

Some of the team members have relatives on opposite sides of the border, and it is hoped the trek will result in a relaxation of rules barring visits by natives — some of whom live within 21 miles of one another on islands in the Bering Strait, separated only by sea ice and Cold War politics.

The six-member U.S. team arrived in this Siberian city of 16,000 Wednesday, after two weather delays.

They joined their six Soviet counterparts for a news conference, a VIP dinner and the beginning of several days of medical experiments. It was the first visit in decades by Americans to this treeless city of locally produced concrete blocks set atop permafrost.

Three Soviets and three Americans on the journey are natives and speak several local dialects. The trek across ancient trade and migration routes up the Siberian side of the Bering Strait and down the Alaskan side is to stop in 18 villages in the Chukotka district of Siberia and 14 in Alaska, organizers said. It will end about April 1 in Kotzebue, Alaska, just above the Arctic Circle.

CHICAGO — Classroom sex education alone appears to have little or no effect on altering sexual activity, according to a review of five studies.

"There's nothing unique about sex education," compared to other information transmitted in school, said Dr. James W. "A person can have the information regarding their health, but it doesn't automatically translate into their behavior."

Stallings warns pesticide review could hurt farmers in Idaho

WASHINGTON — Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, told a House committee Thursday that government plans to review its regulations on 600 agricultural pesticides could hurt Idaho farmers.

Stallings said the plans to reconsider the health effects of "minor-use pesticides" would affect most of the crops grown in the state, including potatoes, sugar beets, barley and beans. Only wheat growers would be unaffected, he said.

"Unless something is done to address the availability of agricultural chemicals used for pest and weed control on these crops, years of efforts of market development, plant research and grower effort will be devastated," Stallings told the House Agriculture Committee hearing, chaired by Rep. George Brown, Jr., a California Democrat.

Hundreds of pesticides must be withdrawn from the market and re-examined for possible health risks, according to a law passed last October. Manufacturers have until June to register the pesticides with the Environmental Protection Agency

and to provide information demonstrating that the chemicals are safe. But Brown, citing "a legacy of neglect in our pesticide regulatory system," called for tighter government controls on agricultural chemicals. In 1983, a congressional study found that only 15 percent of pesticides were backed by necessary health and safety data.

Concern about the dangers of agricultural chemicals has been heightened by the release of a National Resources Defense Council report Monday on the potential cancer-causing effects of some pesticides sprayed on apples and other produce.

Although Stallings supports the new checks on agricultural chemicals, he argued that the high costs will either be passed on to the farmers, or worse still, force chemical manufacturers to withdraw needed pesticides from the market. Instead, the government should shoulder the costs of the new registration process, the Idaho congressman argued.

Manufacturers must first pay a \$100,000 registration fee for each listed pesticide, and must then undertake the costs of required health and safety studies, which could range anywhere between \$100,000 to \$1 million.

The EPA requires studies on groundwater purity, on levels of pes-

ticide absorption in plants and on the amount of chemical residue remaining on produce when it is purchased by the consumer.

Stallings said he has met with pesticide manufacturers in the state who are ready to stop producing the chemicals needed by Idaho farmers rather than going through the re-registration process.



Caracas clashes claim 20 more lives

CARACAS, Venezuela (AP) — Police opened fire on rock-throwing mobs in Caracas slums on Thursday and witnesses said soldiers shot and killed at least 20 people in one area after snipers ambushed and killed an army major.

President Carlos Andres Perez blamed leftists for continuing Venezuela's worst unrest in 31 years of democratic rule.

El Nacional, an independent daily, said in its Friday edition that 300 people had been killed and 1,500 injured in four days of rioting sparked by bus fare hikes. The newspaper said the dead included at least four children, ranging in age from 3 to 14.

That raised the toll from unofficial estimates Thursday of 200 dead and 800 injured in the rioting in the capital and at least 11 cities nationwide.

Perez said after a helicopter tour of capital Thursday that the city of 4 million people was returning to normal.

Witnesses said troops killed at least 20 people overnight in the El Valle neighborhood south of Caracas.

a member of the Armed Services Committee, neither the Senate panel nor the FBI ever considered Jackson's story from the air base as particularly believable — even though they knew nothing about the witness' psychiatric history.

"It was given very little credibility at the time," Cohen said.

After the Senate had been debating the Tower nomination for nearly five hours Thursday that Republicans received a letter from Anne N. Foreman, general counsel of the Air Force, providing the details of Jackson's military record that undermined his story. Sen. John McCain, R-Ariz., quickly rushed to the floor to read aloud from the letter.

Foreman wrote that Jackson had served at Bergstrom from February 1976 and April 1978, and then underwent psychiatric evaluation at Wilfred Hall Medical Center, where it was decided he was no longer fit to perform his Air Force duties. He retired on April 19, 1978.

According to Air Force records, Jackson was in the hospital on the date that he claims to have witnessed Tower's first visit in 1976 and in retirement by the second in 1978.

Tower, a Texan and former chairman of the Armed Services Committee, contends that he visited the Austin, Texas, air base only once in his Senate career — in 1975. According to McCain, Tower's account of his own who were in command of the base at the time, including the retired vice war commander, Maj. Gen. Robert Rohr.

At Bergstrom, Airman 1st Class Tom Carrier told the Los Angeles Times there is no reference in 1976 and 1978 base newspapers of any visit by Tower. He added that such a visit by a member of the Armed Services Committee would have been reported in the newspaper.

to represent how much is spent on education as opposed to social programs, police, prisons and the remaining government services.

The bill provides substantial hikes in state aid to nearly every school district. Calculations made by the Department of Education showed only seven of the 115 school districts will get hikes of over 8 percent.

Senate Education Chairman Jerry Thorne, R-Nampa, maintained the significant increase in education support was being made without a tax hike on the strength of Idaho's robust economic growth. But the bill is part of an evolving overall legislative spending blueprint for the next budget year that has already depleted a \$52-million revenue surplus and charted a course toward a deficit of more than \$16 million.

However, the public school bill was not generally being blamed for the red ink. Most legislative leaders were pointing the finger toward a \$136.3

million hike in state support for higher education, that includes \$20 million in vote-attracting campus construction. That bill, potentially a target for revisions, is scheduled for initial floor action in the House next week.

Under the 1990 aid package, teachers will receive a 5 percent pay hike, an average of just over \$1,000 a year for each teacher, and districts are directed to use their share of another \$3 million to reward the most outstanding members of their teaching corps.

The bill sets aside another \$5.2 million to cut classroom size in the lower grades and allocates the \$12 million in disputed one-time money for education improvement expenses like textbook and equipment purchases or facilities remodeling or renovation.

"We've had some disagreements, but when it comes to the bottom line, I've heard no disagreement," said Senate Finance Chairman Atwell Parry, R-Melba.


House committee approves bill to end water-protection debate

BOISE (AP) — Thwarting a last-minute effort to amend stream anti-degradation legislation, an Idaho House committee approved a bill designed to end nearly four years of controversy over the state's plan to protect its water.

Wednesday's action by the House Resources and Conservation Committee leaves intact the agreement on the plan hammered out last summer by representatives of Gov. Cecil Andrus and environmental and industry groups.

The plan protects Idaho's water from "nonpoint" sources of pollution, such as grazing, crop production, construction, mining, recreation and septic tank disposal.

But the bill, which is geared to ward satisfying anti-degradation requirements of the federal Clean Wa-



ter Act, leaves open the possibility of legislative changes in the agreement next year.

Rep. Bruce Newcomb, R-Burley, inserted the legislative oversight provision into the bill last week despite opposition from the Idaho Conservation League.

Opposition to Newcomb's provisions softened after representatives of five mining groups tried to have several technical changes made in the legislation, Rep. Stan Hawkins,

R-Ucon, backed the efforts of those groups.

"I hate to say this, but your bill looks pretty good," Rep. Jim Stotch-off, D-Sandpoint, told Newcomb.

Newcomb also inserted a provision delaying the effective date of the statute until the Idaho Conservation League's anti-degradation lawsuit is dismissed.

"I know he (Andrus) will sign this the way it is, reluctantly," Newcomb told the committee.

Newcomb, the House majority caucus chairman, said later he had not talked to the governor personally about the bill.

He said he had been told that Andrus would sign the bill if no more changes were made.

"I felt comfortable making that statement," Newcomb said.

Fire budget cut angers Stallings

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, has criticized a Bush administration proposal to help finance firefighting efforts by cutting the amount of money available to counties through the Forest Service receipt-sharing program.

Stallings called the plan "insensitive and unjust" at a House Agriculture Forestry Subcommittee hearing Wednesday on the Forest Service's fiscal 1990 budget.

The proposal to reduce payments to counties from federal timber and mining receipts by 18.4 percent, or \$64 million in fiscal 1990, would have a "serious, adverse impact on Idaho," Stallings said.

He agreed there is a need to find a reliable source of funding for firefighting programs in the future, but said the administration plan was not the answer.

Financing part of the fire program through reduced sharing of receipts is unacceptable, he said.

Overhaul delay slows training at INEL facility

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Delays in overhauling a prototype nuclear reactor have delayed training at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory's Naval Reactors Facility, but the Department of Energy is offering few details about the delays or their effects on NRE operations and employees.

Overhaul of the AIW, a dual-reactor prototype NRE took longer than expected, unnamed Department of Energy officials said in response to written questions submitted by The Idaho Falls Post-Register.

The delay in completion of the AIW overhaul delayed resumption of training operations at AIW, but did not affect training at other prototypes, DOE officials said.

The department did not elaborate on the length of AIW training delays, or how many Naval or civilian employees are affected.

Andrus reappoints ed board members


BOISE (AP) — Gov. Cecil Andrus has reappointed two members of the Idaho Board of Education to new five-year terms.

Diane Bilyeu of Pocatello and Roberta Fields of New Meadows will continue to hold their positions on the eight-member board. Their new terms were effective Wednesday, Andrus said in a statement issued Thursday.

There had been some speculation among people in Idaho's higher education community that Mrs. Bilyeu might not be returned to the board. She reportedly had expressed a desire not to be reappointed, but later changed her mind.

Mrs. Bilyeu is Bannock County assessor, a former state senator and Democrat candidate for Congress. Her husband is state Sen. C.E. "Chick" Bilyeu, D-Pocatello.







Idaho should collect mail-order sales tax

As the entire Idaho budget goes, it may not seem like a lot of money, but we think the Idaho Legislature could pick up a few fast million in leaking revenues by continuing the state's sales tax onto a special category which has been exempt in the past.

That category is the purchase of consumer goods through out-of-state, mail order catalogues.

What, you say, collect sales tax on the L.L. Bean brushed cotton shirt, the blouse from Spiegel's or the goose call from Gander Mountain? Surely there can't be much money in that?

Not so. In a state like Idaho, which to put it gently suffers from a decided lack of high-name retail outlets, an awful lot of money is spent in credit card, mail order purchases. By every estimate, tens of millions of dollars are spent by Idahoans on such out-of-state purchases.

The result is lost sales tax revenue variously estimated at between \$6 and \$13 million annually.

In these times of local economic development, why should local businesses, which collect sales taxes, be at a disadvantage relative to their mail-order counterparts which do not?

That argument is enhanced, in our view, by the so-called multiplier effect of dollars spent locally. Money which leaves the state to a mail-order firm does nothing to build Idaho schools or roads.

One could make the case that mail order purchasers should not be penalized because their own communities don't offer sufficient retail outlets.

But that argument is faulty, in our view, because at this point in time, the two playing fields are unequal.

The woman who buys a pair of slacks out of the Nordstrom's catalogue pays no tax on it. But the woman who buys it at the local Bon Store or the Paris pays the 5 percent sales tax. Is that fair?

Until last year, the state would have had a difficult time collecting the money because, under the law in effect until recently, states were barred from collecting sales taxes except from companies with a "personal presence" within their borders.

But Congress has changed that law and some 20 states have quickly enacted legislation to capture the receipts.

Idaho should join that list, both for the revenue and for reasons of fairness.

Bush must stop public lands giveaway

In the waning days of the Reagan administration, the Department of the Interior took measures to accelerate the transfer of America's public lands to private developers. This land grab confirmed, sadly, that privatization and speculation superseded environmental and public-interest concerns during the Reagan years.

The Bush administration must act decisively to protect America's fragile public domain; failure to do so will further distance the GOP from its noble, if battered, conservationist heritage.

Ronald Reagan's most alarming 11th-hour move was the promise to begin immediately transferring thousands of acres of federal oil shale land, predominantly in Colorado to private speculators for \$2.60 per acre. (Oil shale is a mineral that can be converted into petroleum at very high temperatures. If the conversion process is ever perfected, scientists believe that public oil shale lands could yield 50 percent more than all of OPEC's known reserves.)

Production of oil from shale, however, is not now commercially feasible. After having wasted millions of taxpayer dollars on mismanaged oil shale and other synthetic fuel projects, now is not the time for the government to provide land, virtually free, to a moribund industry.

As if the oil shale grab was not sufficiently profligate, the Reagan administration also proposed lowering the royalties that corporations pay for

coal mined on public lands. That coal is owned by all Americans, and the government has a constitutional obligation to manage it responsibly.

The Reagan Department of the Interior also proposed regulations that would permit corporations to mine in national parks. Even worse, on his final day in office, Reagan's secretary of the interior, Donald Hodel, proposed drilling for oil and gas in parts of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge — a breeding ground for caribou.

Such maneuvers pose a dangerous threat to the nation's dwindling public lands and mark the historic low point in the Republican rejection of environmentalism at the Department of the Interior.

The Republican Party did not always advocate such foothold public land policies. At the turn of the century, Teddy Roosevelt led the party's conservationist Bull Moose wing, and helped create our National Park System.

Since the Progressive era, however, Republican environmentalism has steadily declined.

The Reagan years brought us James Watt and an Department of the Interior willing to permit mining adjacent to the crown jewels of Teddy Roosevelt's cherished national parks: Glacier, Yellowstone and the Grand Canyon. The last-minute moves by Reagan's Department of the In-

terior appeared to signal a final turn away from environmentalism.

If candidate George Bush meant what he said about the importance of the environment, President Bush must return to the historic values of Republican conservation and undo Reagan's last-minute assault on public lands.

Three steps are necessary. First, the department must stop giving away oil shale claims for \$2.50 an acre. If it does not, Congress should declare a moratorium on such sales. Second, Interior should rescind rules that would lower the royalties paid to the public Treasury and instead, consider raising the rates. Finally, the president should make it clear that no mining or drilling will ever take place in the national park system created by his Republican ancestor.

Bush's secretary of the interior, Manuel Lujan Jr., has not made a promising start. Almost immediately after his swearing in, Lujan embarked on a 10-day junket to sunny Guam, Hawaii, Samoa and other Pacific Trust Islands. Before going, Lujan failed to appoint any assistant secretaries, leaving the department to languish. Now, having just returned, the secretary must face up to the grave threats to America's most precious natural heritage.

Catch-22 legal approach dooms nuclear accountability

not imaginary. It is what is happening at the 38-year-old Fernald Feed Materials Production Center in southwestern Ohio. The plant, which from 1951 through 1985 was operated by National Lead of Ohio, has become, as a local paper observed, "an atomic age trash pile."

In the past, government officials went out of their way to emphasize how safe the plant was. "We can assure you that the safety and welfare of our employees at the site and our neighbors in the area surrounding the plant (are) given high priority in

our operations," a Department of Energy official wrote in 1983.

But last September, in response to a suit brought by 14,000 residents, the government reversed itself.

What lies behind the government's turnaround is anything but candor. By insisting that it is to blame for the problems, the government is hoping to immunize National Lead from having to pay damages. The government's hopes rest on the contractor-defense doctrine, established last June by the U.S. Supreme Court.

In that case, the heirs of a Marine Corps helicopter co-pilot killed in a copter crash sued United Technologies under Virginia tort law, charging

that the company had improperly designed its helicopter escape-hatch system. But the court ruled that United Technologies could not be held liable, since it had built the helicopter according to government specifications. The federal government, the Supreme Court said, has a constitutional right to override state law.

The courts will ultimately decide whether the Boyle case applies to Fernald. For the moment, however, it is the plant's 14,000 neighbors who have the upper hand. On Feb. 13, a U.S. District Court judge in Ohio ruled against a motion by the Department of Energy to dismiss the suit because it fell under the govern-

ment contractor defense.

The government's Catch-22 legal strategy is a cause for alarm, for it raises questions about the government's trustworthiness about all nuclear safety. The message is that for as long as possible, government officials will conceal their mistakes; when caught, they will do whatever they can to avoid responsibility. Fernald and sites like it will, to use the government's euphemism, be written off as "national sacrifice zones."

Estimates for cleaning up the nation's nuclear defense plants (the four largest all had to stop production in 1988) run as high as \$200 billion. But just as the government has consis-

tently underestimated the danger of nuclear production, so has it consistently underestimated the cost of nuclear cleanup. If, to avoid liability in a \$300 million suit, the government will resort to a legal strategy designed to allow it and the company involved to avoid paying anything, what will it do in the face of massive cleanup costs? Why should any community — from New York to California — put its faith in officials ruled by a Catch-22 nuclear ethic?

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Soviet Union's ambassador, casting his country in a mediator's role, said Thursday that the furor over Salman Rushdie's novel, "The Satanic Verses," was extremely dangerous and depended for a solution on respect for everyone's religious feelings.

"These are general human rights, and they should be respected," Yuri V. Dubinin, the Soviet ambassador, said at a news conference in which he steered clear of the widespread condemnation of Iranian death threats against the author.

But he stressed that the Soviets "feel the whole situation is very, very dangerous" and that in trying to defuse it "the skill, the science, the art, is to be balanced and to avoid all kind of conflicts."

Dubinina acknowledged there was widespread condemnation of the threats by the Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini and other Iranian clerics who consider the novel to be heretical to Islam. But, he said, "actions and reactions are very, very dangerous, and we think also that if we continue not to be active it would be very harmful to the whole atmosphere."

Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard A. Shevardnadze paid a recent visit to Tehran. Relations with Moscow, which Iran had denounced in the past — along with the United States — as "the Great Satan," are improving.

Dubinin, fielding questions for more than an hour, also said Secretary of State James A. Baker-III probably would visit the Soviet Union in late April or early May.

Budget chief says S&L plan cost could rise

WASHINGTON (AP) — White House budget director Richard Darman, acknowledging Thursday that economic assumptions underlying the administration's savings and loan plan are optimistic, said the cost to taxpayers would increase by more than a third under a less rosy scenario.

Darman, testifying before the Senate Banking Committee, said he did not have "complete confidence" in economic projections left over from the Reagan administration, showing interest rates declining by 5 percentage points over the next five years.

If interest rates, on average, declined 2 percentage points less than the administration projected, budget outlays for the S&L plan from 1989 through 1999 would rise from \$39.9 billion to \$50.6 billion, Darman said.

And if deposits at S&Ls grow at a 4 percent annual rate, instead of the 7 percent projected, budget outlays would swell by another \$4.7 billion, he said.

On another subject, the budget director also vigorously defended President Bush's proposal to spend \$50 billion over the next three years by borrowing the money in a way that keeps it out of the budget deficit.

Darman said if the \$50 billion were added to the deficit, that would risk triggering a larger crisis while Congress and the administration tried to agree on a way to meet the targets of the Gramm-Rudman budget balancing law.

"I think it could well bring the political system to stalemate. ... The net effect ... would be to ... force us into recession," he said.

Britain rejects offer by Iran to negotiate

LONDON (AP) — Britain said Thursday it would not accept new Iranian offers of negotiations until the Islamic government renounces violence in the dispute over the novel 'The Satanic Verses.'

Iran, however, said the overtures for conciliation came from Britain, and that author Salman Rushdie remains subject to 'divine justice.'

Foreign Secretary Sir Geoffrey Howe, meanwhile, said he understood the book was 'deeply offensive' to Muslims, and 'offensive in other ways as well.'


The Foreign Office said it had been contacted Wednesday and Thursday by the Iranian Foreign Ministry proposing a meeting in Geneva this

week.

The Iranians, according to a Foreign Office spokesman, said they wished to discuss a resolution passed Tuesday by the Majlis that gave Britain a week to back away from its defense of Rushdie. Otherwise, diplomatic relations would be severed.


'We saw no merit to a meeting at this stage,' said the spokesman, speaking on condition of anonymity. 'They would have to renounce violence, or the threat of it. That is absolutely cardinal.'

That 'apparently means' Britain would expect Iran to renounce the death sentence pronounced against Rushdie by Iran's spiritual leader Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini on Feb. 14.

Bonn cracks spy ring

BONN, West Germany (AP) — Investigators have cracked a major spy ring in which West German 'hackers' allegedly acquired sensitive military computer passwords and codes and sold them to the Soviets, a government official said Thursday.

A West German TV network said the passwords and other information came from key military and research computers in the United States, Western Europe and Japan.

Several West Germans have been detained on suspicion of obtaining information about access to data-banks, and to have passed that on to Soviet intelligence agents, said Roland Bachmeier, spokesman for the federal interior ministry.

He refused to confirm other details of a report by the Norddeutsche Rundfunk broadcasting network.

The network reported that at the bidding of Soviet agents, the 'hackers' gained access to a key U.S. Defense Department computer as well as to 'important research computers elsewhere.'

They obtained sensitive information that would allow the Soviets themselves to gain access to the computers, the network said.

Among the computers was the U.S. Defense Department's general data-bank known as Optimus, a NASA computer, as well as computers tied to nuclear weapons and energy research in New Mexico and Illinois, the network said.




O'Gorman undergoes surgery

TWIN FALLS — The months of living with drowsiness, pain and a dysfunctional liver are over for Tracie O'Gorman. The 19-year-old Twin Falls woman flew to Omaha, Neb., early Thursday morning to receive a new liver.

O'Gorman's beeper woke her in the dead of night to tell her the liver was available. She'd been on the University of Nebraska Medical Center's liver transplant waiting list since September.

Hospital officials reported Thursday evening O'Gorman was still in surgery but doing well.

Meanwhile, Amber Thacker, a Kimberly 14-year-old, hopes her turn to get a new liver will come soon.

At first a little envious of O'Gorman, Thacker said that now she at least knows her liver transplant will happen — she said

she hopes it will happen soon.

"I think about it every morning when I wake up," she said softly. "I think, 'maybe today.' But I guess you just keep hoping."

The two young women came to the public's attention when they became beneficiaries of the Magic Valley Children's Medical Fund. The fund has dedicated \$7,500 to each young woman to help offset expenses not covered by insurance.

Thacker said she got a message from her parents during her fourth period class Thursday telling of her of O'Gorman's flight to Nebraska.

"At first, I thought 'Oh no, here I go,' but then I saw Tracie's name and I thought 'Ooh, that lucky person,'" she said.

Sherry Thacker, Amber's mother, said the news of Tracie's liver transplant is encouraging, but makes her daughter's disease more real.

"You try to walk around and pretend it's not real, but this does make it real," she said. "And that's hard."

Christian halfway house opens soon

TWIN FALLS — Volunteers preparing for a Christian halfway house for ex-convicts were putting the finishing touches on the building Thursday, the director said.

The halfway house, at 443 Second Ave. N., called Crosswalk Ministries, will be open to the public from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday, said Crosswalk Director Ray Lewis.

Crosswalks is supported by a number of Christian churches and is meant to be a bridge for ex-convicts from a criminal life to a more productive one, he said.

The first resident in the state penitentiary, is expected to come to the 10-bed room home within two weeks, Lewis said. The second will likely follow in April, he

said.

"Then we'll slowly bring them in to help them and us get adjusted," Lewis said.

Lewis, a construction worker and part-time chaplain at the penitentiary, said the two men already earmarked to come in were carefully screened.

He said for each applicant Crosswalk officials review prison records encompassing work habits and interaction with other prisoners and find out the inmate's attitude about change.

Applicants must also sign a house rules contract that requires occupants to seek employment and help pay halfway house expenses. The contract also prohibits smoking and drinking.

"There are some pretty strict rules, but I think it will pay off," he said. "We'll ask

them to leave if they don't follow the rules."

Lewis said the house will depend on donations.

Late last year, when Lewis first revealed plans for the halfway house, a few neighbors said they were concerned about their safety. Lewis said he hopes to talk with the neighbors on Sunday, but he will not tell them "choir boy" types are coming.

"As far as the world looks at them, they're pretty rough people," he said. "But, we're looking for people who are reachable. We just won't allow anyone to come here."

People living at the home will receive counseling and will study Scriptures daily, Lewis said.

Lewis said Crosswalk will work closely with parole and probation officials.

IEA looks for signs of discrimination

TWIN FALLS — Rumors and reports of discrimination in hiring teachers have filtered to the ears of union officials for a couple of years, an Idaho Education Association official said Thursday.

The teachers union has decided to get to the root of the rumors by sending a survey to all Magic Valley teachers.

"I've been disturbed by these reports for a couple of years," IEA Region IV Director Terry Gilbert said in an interview Thursday. "I want the practices to stop, and the only way to stop them is to expose them."

The poll will ask teachers whether they believe they have lost jobs because of discrimination regarding age, sex, religion, handicap or race, and whether they have been asked inappropriate questions or been given inappropriate advice during job interviews.

"The survey will go to all teachers in the Magic Valley to see if a pattern emerges," Gilbert said.

Gilbert also said unemployed teachers who feel they have been discriminated against should contact him.

"We are aware that some districts announce they are hiring a male or female for a position, a practice which can be illegal," Gilbert said.

But few teachers come forward to tell of the discrimination, Gilbert said, so these practices continue.

"The problem is that these people wait a job in the district and they're afraid to make any noise," he said.

Twin Falls School District officials said the survey could "open the door" for anyone who has any type of gripe against a school district.

Assistant Superintendent Keith Tolzin said he hopes the union also takes on the responsibility of checking the complaints to make sure they are valid.

Dealing with these issues should be a joint responsibility between the school district and the union, Tolzin said.

"Let's work on it together instead of making it an adversarial issue," he said Thursday.

A press release announcing the survey highlighted two alleged discrimination incidents.

"In the past year, a teacher applicant was asked during her interview what her religion was. This woman — a Mormon — later learned the district did not care to hire a Mormon, and she was not hired," reads the release.

The union didn't specify which Magic Valley school district was involved. Gilbert acknowledged that, in cases such as this, the district may have a completely different story

from the woman's.

A second example reads: "Approximately one month ago, I was told by a Twin Falls teacher that she was told in the employment interview that if she were interested in the 'union,' the district would not be interested in her."

Keith Farnsworth, Twin Falls School District's personnel director, described the story as a 100 percent falsehood.

He said he could envision a job applicant inquiring whether a teachers union exists in the district. "But that's not any basis for employment," he said.

"If our personnel procedures discriminate, I'd be shocked," Tolzin said. "We're very cautious about that type of thing."

Farnsworth added that religion has nothing to do with employment.

"And I feel very comfortable saying that," he said.

As personnel director, Farnsworth said he sits in on most of the employment interviews, which may occur with either the superintendent, the assistant superintendent, or the school principal.

Gilbert said the first batch of surveys was mailed out Monday.

After compiling the survey's results, the union will inform school district superintendents whether they have a possible problem, the release reads. "So they can arrange to better comply with the law and the Idaho Professional Code of Ethics."

A host of hotels

Buyer of Twin Falls Holiday Inn owns hotels in 5 states

TWIN FALLS — Don't even think about playing Monopoly with H. Roscoe Weston. He would soon own all the hotels.

Weston recently bought the Holiday Inn here for close to \$3 million "because it was for sale," he said.

He dubbed it the Weston Plaza Hotel and added it to his collection of 17.

It's a family tradition among the Westons of Logan, Utah, to own as many hotels as you can get your hands on.

Weston, 67, has been in the hotel business for 22 years with three of his brothers. His son is in the business with him too.

He owns 17 hotels in five states — Idaho, Wyoming, Utah, Montana, and Arizona. Eight are Best Westerns, including the Weston Inn on Blue Lakes Boulevard, which he has owned with two of the brothers for 20 years.

Five of the hotels he owns solely.

Weston held a news conference Thursday to talk about his latest acquisition and to in-

troduce himself to Twin Falls.

Weston was born and raised and still resides in Logan. His corporate headquarters are there. His flour mill is there. His wheat and barley farms, however, are near Rockland, Idaho.

He is a big supporter of buying American-made products, and he does whenever he can. After serving as a bomber pilot in the Pacific theater in World War II, Weston's "residual" feelings make him "unwilling" to drive Japanese cars or buy Japanese products, he said.

Weston has been visiting Twin Falls for 50 years and says the area shows promise. "I don't think Twin Falls is going to be any boom town, but it has had a history of steady growth that I believe will continue," Weston said.

The Holiday Inn was losing money not making a profit when he bought it, but Weston said, "I think I can turn it around and make it profitable."

He plans a number of improvements, additions and changes that should be complete

BOISE — The proposed public schools funding bill passed in the Senate Thursday could mean smaller classrooms, new textbooks, special programs, higher salaries for entry-level teachers and rewards for the best teachers.

The Senate voted 32-10 to spend \$394.3 million on public education next year, an increase that would give most Magic Valley schools a boost in state funding of around 10 percent.

"It sounds great," said Cassia County Superintendent Norman Hurst. Cassia will receive 10.6 percent more state money, although his actual budget won't increase that much. A varying portion of each school district's budget is raised through property taxes that are generally limited to a 5 percent annual increase.

In Twin Falls, the difference will probably mean that, unlike last year, the district will not have to ask taxpayers to vote in a tax override above the 5 percent increase, said Assistant Superintendent Keith Tolzin.

The funding bill, which must still pass the House and be signed by the governor, would start by increasing each school's base support enough to pay for a 2.5 percent inflation of operating costs and a 5 percent salary increase for employees.

On top of that is money tied to a smorgasbord of special projects.

School districts would need their proposed projects approved by the state Board of Education before they received much of that money. While some legislators argued that would remove local control, supporters said it would encourage accountability

and help the state trace how education dollars are spent.

The provision doesn't seem to have most school administrators worried.

"We think we can show the Legislature and the people we'll put the money to good use," Tolzin said.

Above the base support, the Senate agreed to spend \$5.2 million for school improvement projects approved by the state. Legislators specified not only what those improvement projects would be, but assigned priorities.

Topping the list is smaller classrooms, where needed, in first through third grades. Next is development of special programs such as more counseling, tutoring and other attempts to reduce drop-out rates. Third is more teachers for below- or above-average students, and fourth is more teachers to expand or improve curriculum.

In Twin Falls, Tolzin said hiring more counselors is a good bet, with the district's \$133,577 share of the school improvement money.

Robert Stuart Junior High School and the high school both are short a counselor, and the district would like to begin offering counseling for grade school students troubled by family problems like alcoholism.

The School Board also is interested in reducing class sizes in the early grades, Tolzin said. Those classes

generally have 24 to 26 students, he said.

More controversial in the appropriation budget is \$12 million in money that legislators aren't promising educators will be there next year.

School districts are required, under the watchful eyes of the Department of Education, to spend it on items that "won't require additional outlays the next year: textbooks and supplies; classroom teaching equipment; library books; or remodeling needed to house more and smaller classes in first through third grade."

Although most state money is distributed according to a formula favoring small schools based roughly on number of classrooms, this would allot half the \$12 million on a per-pupil basis that favors large schools. In Twin Falls that would mean a total of \$376,120.

Kimberly Superintendent Richard Bauser said the money his district receives will be welcome, but won't go too far beyond purchasing plans already made. The school plans to buy new math books in all 12 grades.

The final portions of the budget address teacher pay. The state would appropriate \$3.5 million to attract and keep good teachers.

Half a million dollars would be used for districts that want to pay experienced teachers \$1,000 to shepherd new teachers through their first year in the classroom. The program also extends to administrators.

The other \$3 million would first go to raising entry-level salaries to \$46,000. Unfortunately, depending on each district's appropriation, that may not be enough. In Twin Falls County, Sen. Laird Noh, R-Kimberly, estimates that Hansen's \$5,168 will fall short of the mark.

But in the Twin Falls School Dis-

trict, the \$74,117 that would be appropriated for salary equity would more than pay for the increase.

Schools with money left over would be asked to pay for a career ladder program approved by the Legislature several years ago, but never funded. Because of the uncertainty of funding and because many career ladder plans were rejected, only Filer, Jerome and Minidoka could participate in the program this year.

The career ladder programs generally set up criteria — beyond the traditional ones of education and experience — for teachers to advance on a supplemental pay scale. In some cases extra duties would be required.

Schools not on the career ladder program could spend the money for an alternate merit pay program or to pay junior high and high school math and science teachers more.

The extra pay proposals aren't sitting well with some teachers.

"We appreciate the amount of dollars. We just don't think they are allocated correctly," said teacher Nick Nicholson, who has lobbied legislators this session on behalf of the Twin Falls Education Association.

Efforts to pay some teachers more than others with identical education and experience may cause more problems than they solve, he said. What parent will want their child in an ordinary teacher's classroom rather than one identified as exceptional, he said. The proposed merit pay programs are limited to a third of all teachers.

The 5 percent overall increase will not be enough to close the gap between average teacher pay here and elsewhere in the region and nation, he said. Idaho teacher salaries rank 45th nationally and are the lowest offered in the Northwest.

Lottery doesn't permit reservation bingo, says advisory opinion

BOISE (AP) — Idaho's state lottery does not authorize Indian tribes to play bingo on the reservation, the Idaho Lottery Commission has been advised.

"I'm convinced we can operate scratch ticket and on-line games in Idaho without the tribes having the legal right to operate bingo," said Lottery Director Wally Hedrick, after receiving the advisory opinion.

Hedrick requested a legal opinion from Attorney General Jim Jones.

The Lottery Commission is working on rules and regulations that will allow the start of the lottery approved by voters in the last general election.

Hedrick asked whether those rules would allow Indian tribes to operate on-reservation bingo games. Idaho has five Indian tribes, and Hedrick said several have expressed interest in running legal bingo games.

"We think this lays to rest the possibility of gaming on Indian reservations," said board spokesman Bob Cooper.

The advisory said the federal Indian Gaming Regulatory Act authorizes Indian tribes to have some gaming or gambling operations valid under state law.

The commission's regulations would affect the tribes' authority to operate bingo games only if the commission were to take the unusual step of adopting bingo as part of the Idaho State Lottery, the advisory said.

The memorandum said Idaho is in a unique situation.

Idaho is the only state with a substantial Indian population which allows Class III games (such as lotteries and pari-mutual gambling) while prohibiting the operation of charitable bingo games, it said.

The Idaho situation — banning all forms of bingo but allowing more sophisticated games such as pari-mutual gambling and a state lottery — apparently does not fit in with the federal law on Indian gaming.

"However, there are strong opinions that Congress intended that tribes operate only specific games permitted by state law," the advisory said.

Class I games lie exclusively within the jurisdiction of Indian tribes, the advisory said. They include traditional forms of Indian gambling in connection with tribal ceremonies and celebrations, and social games, played for prizes of minimal value.

The legal report said pull tabs, punch boards and other "instant winner" games are a subset of bingo.

"We're going to take a harder look at the situation," Zollinger said.

Construction on Magic Valley Regional Medical Center's planned cancer treatment center is scheduled to begin June 1, but it could have to be postponed if the amendment is not approved.

The CSI room was chosen because the county commissioners expect a large crowd.

Hempleman said he thought the hospital will try to establish that the budget situation should be classified as an emergency.

Decision near on landing restrictions

HAILEY — A decision on easing Horizon Airline landing restrictions is expected by mid-March.

More than a dozen Federal Aviation Administration officials from across the country were in Hailey last week to evaluate a request to lower the decision height to 1,500 feet from the current 2,500. The change would only be for instrument landings.

The decision height is the point at which Horizon pilots, approaching the airport from the north and using a signal from their microwave landing system (MLS), must be able to see the runway. If visual contact is not possible, they must pull out of the landing pattern and the landing is aborted.

The higher than normal 2,500-foot decision height was required by the FAA when Horizon first installed the MLS in the summer of 1987. Horizon's request to lower this height comes after 18 months' experience

using the system.

The officials were from Washington, D.C., Seattle, Atlanta and Oklahoma City is expected by the end of March.

But Thursday Gov. Cecil Andrus fixed a quirk in the law that named Albion, population 356, the county seat for the 20,300 people of Cassia County. The new county seat, site of the Cassia County Courthouse, will be Burley.

In 1920 county residents voted to move the county seat from Albion to Burley when a land reclamation project swelled the northern county population. The change was made in all but name.

When the discrepancy was discovered 69 years later, Sen. Denton Darrington, R-Declo, and Rep. Bruce Newcomb, R-Burley, pushed the change through the Legislature. Andrus signed the change into law Thursday.



Stock market mounts a strong advance

NEW YORK — A drop in interest rates helped the stock market stage a broad advance Thursday, recouping Wednesday's losses.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrials, down 16.35 on Wednesday, climbed 27.67 to 2,955.71.

Advancing issues outnumbered declines by more than 2 to 1 in nationwide trading of New York Stock Exchange-listed stocks, with 982 up, 471 down and 506 unchanged.

Volume on the floor of the Big

Board came to 161.98 million shares, down from 177.31 million in the previous session. Nonetheless, consolidated volume in NYSE-listed issues, including trades in those stocks on regional exchanges and in the over-the-counter market, totaled 191.87 million shares.

Gainers among the blue chips included Union Carbide, up 1 1/4% at 30 3/4; American Telephone & Telegraph, up 1/4% at 30 1/4; International Business Machines, up 1/2% at 120 1/4; and Exxon, up 1/4% at 44 1/4.

Dun & Bradstreet fell 2 1/2% to 50. The Wall Street Journal reported that the company faces a controversy over sales practices involving the credit data it compiles.

Storage Technology led the active

list, up 1/4% at 2 1/4. The company reported fourth-quarter earnings of 10 cents a share, up from 3 cents in the comparable period a year earlier.

SSMCO rose 1 1/4% to 34 1/4. On Wednesday, Semi-Tech Electronics (Par East) raised its bid for SSMCO to \$34 a share, topping a \$33-a-share offer from Vincent Tan, a Malaysian investor.

National Education, which was added to Standard & Poor's 500-stock composite index, gained 1/4% to 25 1/4.

Minnetonka, the most active issue in the over-the-counter market, jumped 8 1/2% to 2 1/4. The company retained an investment banking firm to advise it on a possible sale or other transaction.

As measured by Wilshire Associates' index of more than 5,000 actively traded stocks, the market in-

creased \$26.64 billion, or 0.90 percent, in value.

The NYSE's composite index of all its listed common stocks added 1.47 to 163.21.

Standard & Poor's industrial index rose 3.34 to 334.82, and S&P's 500-stock composite index was up 2.84 at 289.95.

The NASDAQ composite index for the over-the-counter market gained 2.73 to 402.53.

The host of the wrestling matches needs to expect a lot of kids and a lot of supporters.

A small meet will have 300 to 400 kids participating in it. This week-end, matches will be held in Caldwell, American Falls and Idaho Falls. In total, the wrestlers at all three meets will reach over 2,200 total with 1,000 participating in the Idaho Falls meet alone.

The meets offer a match for every two age groups for every five pounds, so a participant always has a wrestler his own size and age to compete with.

Kids 5 to 6 are the first to compete. The age groups continue until they reach the 17-, 18- and 19-year-olds. These are commonly referred to as the juniors.

For the older groups, the clubs are a great way of refining skills. The majority of state high school champions in Idaho have or had some type of freestyle background.

The season lasts for eight weeks and winds up in mid-April.

The final matches will be the state tournament, held in the second week-end in April. The winners will qualify to regional competition.





The King and I Theater group prepares production of musical

TWIN FALLS — Watching a rehearsal for the Dilettantes' upcoming production of "The King and I" is like peering into a dozen different worlds at the same time.

The most obvious contrast is dress. The cast members, rehearsing in sweatshirts and jeans, skillfully recreate the world of an exotic 19th century monarchy.

Even the actors themselves are quite a varied group. "We have a real eclectic mix of people in this production," says Greg English, the play's publicity chairman, as he pointed out a few business executives, lawyers, dentists and teachers.

Even the addresses are varied. Director Mike Winterholler is from Jerome. Musical Director Bruce Whitehead hails from Jackpot, while choreographer Fred Scheibe made the trip over from Lewiston. In fact, Scheibe is the perfect example of the interesting types of people who spend five nights a week rehearsing "The King and I." The Lewiston native returned to his hometown in 1964, after spending 12 years dancing on Broadway, sharing the stage with stars like Eartha Kitt, Carol Lawrence and Howard Keel.

"I was burned out with show business, determined never to set foot on the stage again," says Scheibe, who worked for a time as an accountant. "If I'd stayed in New York, I would have had three or four bypasses and be dead by now."

Before long, though, Scheibe was directing and choreographing shows all across Idaho. Today, he is full-time artistic director in Lewiston, the only city in Idaho to employ someone for such a position.

During a recent visit to Twin Falls, Scheibe painstakingly outlined the dance routines for the young dancers in "The King and I." They watch him carefully as they fly through the air and crouch on the floor. "I enjoy working with these kids," he says. "They may be green, but they really put out."

Among the more than 70 cast and crew members in "The King and I," there are 14 young performers, ranging in age from 7 to 13. For instance, there is 8-year-old Jacob Jontunen, a "sandy-haired" Morningside grade schooler who wears a Seattle Seahawks T-shirt. "I've been in other plays and it's kind of hard work but not really because it's fun," he says during a rehearsal break.

"My friends want to play with me more, but I can't always because I have piano and stuff."

This kind of dedication is evident among all of the cast members — David Lay, who plays the king (but will not be required to shave his head for the part); Alice Anderson, a College of Southern Idaho home economics and fashion merchandising instructor and vocal student of Martha Mead, who found time in her busy schedule to

Writing for The New Yorker magazine at the time of the film's American release, reviewer Pauline Kael called the three-hour-long "Kaos" "too much movie," and "too harsh beauty."

Yet, in all, Kael's review reflected her awe of the film and its makers.

She claimed "Kaos," though too long for her taste, left her "dazed and happy."

Other films in the series include: "MacArthur's Children," March 16; "Babette's Feast," March 22; "Bagdad Cafe," March 29 and "Ginger and Fred," April 6.

500 young musicians are here in music fest

TWIN FALLS — Twin Falls will be invaded Saturday by more than 500 youths.

But they will be on a peaceful, cultural mission, bringing only their musical ability with them.

The youthful musicians will be participating in the annual Music Festival, sponsored by the Twin Falls Junior Music Club.

They will perform privately at College of Southern Idaho band room, LDS churches on Elizabeth Boulevard and Eastern Avenue, says Patty Hadley, festival chairman.

Each participant will play or sing before a judge and receive constructive criticism and a rating.

"It's not a competition in the usual sense. Each musician competes against himself," she says.

He has been associated with the





'Excellent Adventure' could become your worst nightmare

The following are capsule reviews of some of the films playing locally in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and the opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.



ACCIDENTAL TOURIST (PG). This transposition by director, co-writer Lawrence Kasdan of Anne Tyler's warm and singular novel bristles with eccentric, memorable characters, part of whose fun for us comes in measuring just how close they are to the faces in our bathroom mirror each morning. It contains a performance by William Hurt so finely observed and so tenderly acted that it borders on the preternatural. Also stars Kathleen Turner and Geena Davis.

BILL & TED'S EXCELLENT ADVENTURE (PG). This is Allan Bloom's worst nightmare, and possibly yours, too. It is an all-out celebration of the glories of the American mind, with two high school doofuses (Keanu Reeves and Alex Winter) borrowing a time machine to kidnap great figures of past centuries for a history report. Look for two of the

low points of American teen-age cinema: one movie: Joan of Arc leads an aerobics class, and Abraham Lincoln tells an assembly of school kids to "Party on, dudes!" This witless film could be more imbecilic or less excellent...dues.

THE BURBS (PG). Grimly unfunny comedy about three suburban husbands (Tom Hanks, Bruce Dern and Rick Ducommun) who behave like little boys when a Munsterlike family moves in a ramshackle Victorian house on their cul-de-sac. Big setback for fans of Hanks, freshly Oscar nominated for Big. With Carrie Fisher, Corey Feldman.

HER ALIBI (PG). This mystery is certainly elegant looking, but 15 minutes into the action the thrill is gone

and director Bruce Beresford seems to have no clue as to how to find it. Tom Selleck plays a mystery writer who has hit a writing block, so he hits a few real courtrooms, looking for inspiration. Coch-born actress-model Paulina Porizkova plays a Romanian mystery woman and before you can say jurisprudence, Selleck has lied gracefully, providing Porizkova with an alibi at her murder trial.

RAIN MAN (R). Because we have had dozens of buddy films about journeys of discovery, we can plot the scenario of this one like a road map. The special qualities of one will work on the other to change him, or perhaps both of them. Dustin Hoffman makes his autistic savant character hypnotic

cally interesting and sometimes terribly funny. Tom Cruise gives his loosest, most authoritative performance since Risky Business and it can be said unblushingly that he holds his own with the masterly Hoffman.


THREE FUGITIVES (PG-13). Nick Nolte and Martin Short have some funny moments as an inadvertent and ill-matched team of bank robbers, but in his American directorial debut, Francis Verbeke shows that in working in English he is capable of the same overly broad and vulgar strokes that marred the various American adaptations of his French pictures. With Sarah Rowland Doroff as Short's troubled little daughter, James Earl Jones, Kenneth McMillan.

WORKING GIRL (R). For those who missed the special Melanie Griffith blend of moxie and down-to-earth sensuality in "Something Wild and Stormy Monday," this is a chance to

meet her in the very best of company: romantically entangled with Harrison Ford, directed by Mike Nichols and in a savagely funny screenplay by Kevin Wade. It is a working-Cinderella story in which Griffith plays a

more-than-bright Staten Islander with a fierce yen to climb out of the secretarial pool at their Wall Street brokerage job. With Sigourney Weaver, Joan Cusack, Alec Baldwin and Olympia Dukakis.

'Burbs' leads week at the box office

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Critics may want to avoid "The burbs" but audiences continued to love Tom Hanks' domestic comedy as the movie led the box-office charts for the second week in a row.

According to weekend figures released Monday, "The burbs," starring Hanks as a suburban home owner pushed to the brink by unusual neighbors, collected \$6 million to claim the No. 1 spot.

It was followed by "Rain Man," the hit Dustin Hoffman-Tom Cruise road drama, which grossed \$4.71 million for second place.

In third was "Bill and Ted's Excellent Adventure," a comedy about two teen-age time travelers, with ticket sales of \$4.66 million.

"Dangerous Liaisons," the drama about aristocratic seductions in pre-revolutionary France, moved up to No. 4 on receipts of \$2.8 million. But the critically acclaimed movie, playing on more than twice as many screens as the previous week, suffered a 58 percent drop in per-screen averages.

"Three Fugitives," featuring Nick Nolte and Martin Short as outlaws on the lam with Short's young daughter in tow, finished in fifth, grossing \$2.7 million.

It was followed in sixth place by "Beaches," starring Bette Midler and Barbara Hershey, which collected \$2.31 million. In seventh was "Cousins," the romantic comedy with Ted Danson and Isabella Rossellini, on a gate of \$2.26 million.

In eighth was the slimy sequel "The Fly II," with \$2.1 million. Bounding out the Top 10 were the corporate Cinderella story "Working Girl," in ninth with \$1.9 million, and the courtroom drama "True Believer," in tenth with \$1.8 million.



500 young musicians are here in music fest

TWIN FALLS — Twin Falls will be invaded Saturday by more than 500 young musicians.

But they will be on a peaceful, cultural mission, bringing only their musical ability with them.

The youthful musicians will be participating in the annual Music Festival, sponsored by the Twin Falls Junior Music Club.

They will perform privately at College of Southern Idaho, basing out and LDS churches, on Elizabeth Boulevard and Eastland Drive, says Patty Hadley, festival chairman.

Each participant will play or sing before a judge and receive constructive criticism and a rating.

It's not a competition in the usual sense. Each musician competes against himself," she says.

Most of the students will perform on piano, with a few playing wind instruments and guitars. There also will be about 25 vocalists.

Ten-piano judges from Boise, Nampa, Gooding and Rupert and three judges for instrumental and voice categories will spend the day listening to young musicians from elemen-

The Twin Falls Junior Music festival offers a special place for the many young pianists and other private students to receive feedback on their work, she says.

Students who have earned gold cups will perform at a recital at 7 p.m. March 20 at the Tyler Street Baptist Church.

"Those She Left Behind" explores single parenthood when mom dies

By WENDY WALLACE

Life is going well for businessman Scott Grimes (Gary Cole) in the NBC movie "Those She Left Behind," airing March 6. His eagerness to build a new dream home is matched by his wife Sue's enthusiasm. And both are eagerly looking forward to the arrival of their first child. But his domestic tranquility is shattered when Sue dies from an aneurysm during childbirth and Scott is left alone with his newborn daughter, Katie.

"When I read the script, my reaction was this is different somehow," says Cole. "There seemed to be a very strange dilemma that Grimes was going through. He's shocked at the beginning, and he falls down a well. The whole thing is trying to climb back out of it, and that seemed interesting and different to me, especially for prime-time television. That's what attracted me to the role."

Often actors try to develop expertise before they take on a role. But for this one, Cole took advantage of his ignorance.

Boston station offers service for the blind

BOSTON (AP) — A public television station that pioneered closed captions for the hearing impaired has developed a new service that makes television vivid for the blind.

By tuning a special channel on a stereo television or home video recorder, the service allows blind people to hear a narrator describe the action in a program between pauses in dialogue.

Boston's public station, WGBH, tested the service last year and is now seeking funding to make it available to the nation's estimated 12 million visually impaired people in January 1990.

"I never realized when I watched television, from a listening perspective, that I was missing so much," Kim Charlson recalled Tuesday. Blind since the age of 11, the 31-year-old Watertown resident was among thousands of visually im-

"Scott is a character who can't deal with anything," he says. "He didn't know anything about children, and that's part of the whole story. I never handled children as much as I did here. I mean, I've held other people's babies, but I've never had to deal with their moods. But I didn't feel that I should get acquainted with babies and be aware of parenting, because he's not. I thought I was fully qualified because I didn't know a thing."

While Scott's estranged mother Margaret (Colleen Dewhurst) and co-worker Diane Pappas (Joanna Kerns) share his grief, he resists getting too close to his daughter. His frustration mounts as he struggles to rebuild his life and cope with an infant, while battling with the day-to-day demands of running his real-estate business. Unable to resolve his situation and finding himself blaming the child for his wife's death, Scott decides to temporarily give Katie up for adoption.

"The whole thing goes back to his wife dying," says Cole. "Anything about his anger or frustration toward the child is thrown back to his wife's death. In his mind, at first, the child is a bad memory, and part of him actually blames the child for his wife's death. That's why he's so close to the

edge."

Cole came to national attention in 1984 with his critically acclaimed performance as convicted murderer Dr. Jeffrey McConkild, the ex-Green Beret doctor accused of murdering his family in "Fatal Vision." He is currently starring as Jack Killian, a cop turned radio talk-show host, in the new NBC series "Midnight Caller."

"Midnight Caller" seems to be doing well," he says. "I've been pleased with the work and the people that we've gotten to be on the show. I like the hours, I like the constancy of it. I like working all the time."

"This is the first time in my life I've known what I'm going to be doing three months down the line," he adds. "And as far as the character is concerned, I just seem to get a little more relaxed as it goes on."

Soap opera scene

Grand opera-bound Nada Rowand now enjoys soap role in 'Loving'

Nada Rowand, who is seen as Kate Rescott in ABC's "Loving," aspired to be an opera singer and probably never dreamed that one day she would be working in an opera of another kind — namely, the soaps.

Most fans know her as the no-nonsense boardinghouse proprietor in "Loving" and would probably pass her right by if they encountered her on the street. That's how different Nada is from Kate.

In person, Nada is a sophisticated, witty and worldly woman who has come a long way from her childhood spent amid the cornfields of Melvin, Ill. It was there that the always vibrant Nada decided that she was going to be a performer. She entered all types of contests sponsored by such organizations as the 4-H clubs, and eventually was hooked with some of her high school friends on "The Ted Mack Amateur Hour." The group called itself The Cloverettes, and Nada remembers that they were pretty good.

Music was to be Nada's life and she enrolled in the music school at the University of Illinois. Right after graduation, Nada boarded the bus and headed East for New York and grand opera. When she found she wasn't exactly ready for the Met, she gravitated toward the musical comedy theater via jobs in stock and eventually on Broadway.

While appearing in the musical "Milk and Honey," Nada became a protegee of the show's star, opera singer Robert Weede. She moved to San Francisco, where she studied with Weede, and then went to Germany to try to establish her opera career.

Nada came close, but there was to be no brass ring. That's when she decided to leave her dreams of an opera career behind and concentrated on getting work as an actress. She studied with the famous Uta Hagen and was featured in a number of Broadway and dinner theater musicals. TV was next, but she always kept her hand in theater and worked with most of the major regional theater companies.

In 1983 she was offered the role of Kate in "Loving," and she has been playing it ever since. She also ventured into a successful sideline — a

A viewer tuned to the play "Lemon Sky," for example, could hear as the credits rolled: "A mountain silhouette in the distance, palm trees closer. A boy's bike between a high, brown wooden fence. In the foreground a white, mid-50s convertible gleaming in the sun, its top down."

Then later, after a character spoke his lines: "He strolls away from the car toward the house, pausing in the doorway."

"I see it as something that can become widely popular and should be," said John De Witt, who evaluates high-tech aides for the blind at the American Federation for the Blind in New York.

"It's not a question only of people who are totally blind," De Witt said in a telephone interview. "There are millions of people who have very poor vision and cannot see small details on the screen, people who are losing their vision at any time of life."

Credit for the idea is given to Margaret Pfanstiehl, founder of Metropolitan Washington Ear, a radio reading service based in Silver Spring, Md. Ms. Pfanstiehl found a way for theaters to offer narration for blind people with audio headsets.

It became accessible for television through stereo TV and VCRs after establishment of the Separate Audio Program channel about five years ago. About 10 percent of American homes can tap the audio channel now. But Laurie Everett, director of Descriptive Video Services predicted they will be commonplace before the turn of the century.

"In a couple of years you won't be able to buy a television that isn't stereo," she said.

WGBH is trying to raise funds to launch the service nationally five hours a week. Ms. Everett said, needing \$300,000 to start up and another \$1 million annually.

David Letterman has entire town as guests

NEW YORK (AP) — They oohed and aahed at Times Square and the Statue of Liberty, then gasped when the tour bus squeezed within 2 inches of a truck as it maneuvered through Manhattan's clogged streets on Wednesday.

The folks from Bolan, Iowa, were clearly a long way from home.

"You'll never run into this traffic in Bolan," said Linda Nydegger. "I like to visit but I sure wouldn't want to live here."

"We wave at everybody. They give each other the bird," said Daryl McCready, comparing motorists in Bolan and Manhattan.

The entire population of Bolan's metropolitan area — six Bolanites and 10 from the "suburbs" — had taken David Letterman up on his offer to visit the big city.

Letterman, prompted by a staffer intrigued by Bolan, paid for the Iowans to come to New York for three days and appear on his show, "Late Night with David Letterman."

On the show, Letterman immediately tried to dig up the dirt on a town where everybody knows everybody and then some. "Do you have a town slut?" he asked Ruth Hansen, 73. "If so, when she comes up, point her out."

Mrs. Hansen, a 50-year resident, chuckled at that. She and Bolan's oldest resident, Agnes DeMaris, 78, were interviewed during Wednesday's taping of the show to air early

Thursday. Then Letterman brought the whole town onstage.

Letterman also put on the spot Lori Nydegger, 23, a weekend resident who helped organize a standstill parade — it doesn't move and spectators walk around it — to celebrate the town's 100th anniversary three years ago.

"So, you're just here for the free trip," Letterman said as she blushed and shook her head. "Let's string her up."

Mrs. DeMaris, who is confined to a wheelchair, said in an interview afterwards that she didn't want to make the trip because of her physical condition but the Letterman staff insisted on the entire town's attendance.

"When they told me the rest of them couldn't go if I didn't, I decided I wouldn't make them people stay home because of me," she said. "I'll be tired tomorrow."

Hirohito documentary will probably raise ire

HOLLYWOOD — After the solemnity and pageantry of Friday's state funeral for Emperor Hirohito is over, and all the kings, presidents and other leaders from 163 nations, along with the global representation of TV crews, have packed up and gone home, "Hirohito: Behind the Myth" will come noisily to public television.

Such is the content of this controversial "re-examination" of the late Japanese emperor who reigned for more than six decades through the rise of Japanese militarism, World War II, Japan's postwar recovery and economic expansion, that the BBC withheld its broadcast for more than two weeks after his death on Jan. 7. And PBS is waiting until after the funeral and will do a wrap-around commentary to better balance the production.

Written and narrated by Edward Behr — author of "The Last Emperor," upon which last year's Oscar-

winning movie about China's Pu Yi was based — the BBC production gives the strong impression that Hirohito was "fully responsible for the war," that he "could have called off Pearl Harbor" and that he could well have been put in the dock as a war criminal.

Behr's 500-page book "Hirohito: Behind the Myth" will be published later this year. The 65-minute program, "Behind the Myth," will air on PBS Thursday night.

At least two specialists on Japan — Edwin O. Reischauer, former Harvard historian and ambassador to Japan from 1961 to 1966, and John Toland, author of the 1970 Pulitzer-winning "The Rising Sun" — say that the program should not be shown because it is severely flawed in content and context.

Other historians have expressed their major criticisms, but still believe that it should be broadcast because, 44 years after the end of World War II, it will further understanding of a watershed period of

Hirohito documentary will probably raise ire

HOLLYWOOD — After the solemnity and pageantry of Friday's state funeral for Emperor Hirohito is over, and all the kings, presidents and other leaders from 163 nations, along with the global representation of TV crews, have packed up and gone home, "Hirohito: Behind the Myth" will come noisily to public television.

Such is the content of this controversial "re-examination" of the late Japanese emperor who reigned for more than six decades through the rise of Japanese militarism, World War II, Japan's postwar recovery and economic expansion, that the BBC withheld its broadcast for more than two weeks after his death on Jan. 7. And PBS is waiting until after the funeral and will do a wrap-around commentary to better balance the production.

Written and narrated by Edward Behr — author of "The Last Emperor," upon which last year's Oscar-

winning movie about China's Pu Yi was based — the BBC production gives the strong impression that Hirohito was "fully responsible for the war," that he "could have called off Pearl Harbor" and that he could well have been put in the dock as a war criminal.

Behr's 500-page book "Hirohito: Behind the Myth" will be published later this year. The 65-minute program, "Behind the Myth," will air on PBS Thursday night.

At least two specialists on Japan — Edwin O. Reischauer, former Harvard historian and ambassador to Japan from 1961 to 1966, and John Toland, author of the 1970 Pulitzer-winning "The Rising Sun" — say that the program should not be shown because it is severely flawed in content and context.

Other historians have expressed their major criticisms, but still believe that it should be broadcast because, 44 years after the end of World War II, it will further understanding of a watershed period of

the 20th century.

Barry Chase, PBS vice president for public-affairs programming, said that he thought it was useful to bring the role of Hirohito into question. He also suggests that Behr's "moderate" interpretation of Hirohito between the two extremes — where wartime propaganda equated him with Hitler, and that of the more recent marine biologist period — will eventually be accepted by history.

But after seeing the final version in November, he said, he decided to put it "into a (discussion) package to permit some sort of extension of the discussion it would prompt." PBS has arranged to tape on Monday — interspersed with funeral footage — a round-table discussion with Behr, Carol Gluck, professor of history at Columbia University; Akira Iriye, professor of history at the University of Chicago and visiting professor at the University of Hawaii; and CBS correspondent Robert Krulwich.

The film raises questions that have engrossed historians for years and brings to the forefront attitudes about Japan that still prevail in countries like Great Britain where the decision to send Prince Philip to the funeral raised a fury. Behr him-

self is British.

"My feeling is the emperor should have been tried, from the standpoint of a lawyer," Robert Donihi, one of the 16 American prosecuting lawyers at the Tokyo trials says toward the end of the program, "that ... there was evidence enough to proceed to trial against him, and that had he been tried, he would have been convicted, most likely would have been hanged."

Donihi quickly explains, however, that the prosecutors had no complaint with the 11 involved nations' decision not to bring Hirohito to trial (In his memoirs, Gen. Douglas MacArthur wrote that tragic consequences would have followed, "such an unjust action," including guerrilla warfare and the need for at least 1 million reinforcements).

Even what to label "Behind the Myth" is at issue. Is it a documentary, as Behr, PBS and others consider it, or a docudrama because, interspersed through Allied and Japanese newsreel footage are scenes of actors who, as in a silent movie, play Hirohito and other key figures behind a shimmering screen? Actors also speak words of dead diary writers.

"So unsound, such bad history," Reischauer contended in an inter-

view. Considering the kind of "bad" justice meted out at the war-crimes trials, a war criminal charge might have held. Reichsauer added, but taking "the same case under more normal circumstances they couldn't possibly have found him guilty. (Hirohito) really didn't have any deciding power."

"Twisted," Toland said in a separate interview, and "Japan-bashing. ... To me it's a shocking thing to try and destroy a man's character. Hirohito's probably going to be looked upon as one of the best emperors in the business. As far as humanitarianism and democracy, he did not think of himself, he only thought of his people. ..."

Reichsauer, Toland and other historians have already seen a videocassette of "Behind the Myth" courtesy of Boston's WGBH-TV, the presenting station, or from colleagues.

It is precisely the "myth" of Hirohito, as Behr puts it — of "the peace-loving marine biologist reluctantly forced into war" — that Behr challenges.

"There's plenty of evidence to show," Behr says at the top of the broadcast, "that he was neither quite the puppet nor the pacifist that his image-builders have made him out to be." He also suggests that Hirohito's main concern was survival.

"It's a flawed film but a film which deserves an airing," said John Dower, professor of history and Japanese studies at the University of California, San Diego, and author of "War Without Mercy." "It shouldn't be a taboo subject anywhere. A lot of the reason the actual role of the emperor is obscured is that the Americans as well as Japanese blocked serious research of this subject. ... There was, in effect, a cover-up at the end of the war."

What bothers historians of varying shades of opinion are questions not only of fact, but of context and interpretation. "In history, the interpretation is as important as the facts," said Gluck of Columbia.

Behr explains at the start of "Behind the Myth" that, while researching the life of Hirohito, he "discovered a wealth of contradictory detail" in Japanese documents and diaries that "had been ignored or perhaps deliberately overlooked." But historians including Dower maintain that "a lot of the 'new finds' are old things," and Behr "has simply misrepresented the originality of what he is finding."

"Then why all the fuss?" countered Behr in a recent interview from London.

Recent Medicare changes mean increased taxes for seniors

WASHINGTON—While President Reagan's signing of the Medicare Catastrophic Loss Protection Act last July will provide additional health coverage, it also will mean more in taxes for the approximately 32 million Medicare enrollees. The increased benefits will be funded by a surtax levied against all "Medicare-eligible" individuals whose tax liability exceeds \$150. Generally, this means anyone who is 65 or older and entitled to receive Medicare benefits—whether or not they actually receive or apply for them. Called a "sup-

plemental premium," this new surtax will begin in the 1989 tax year. It will amount to \$22.50 for every \$150 of federal income tax liability, with a ceiling of \$800 per person. By 1993, the premium will nearly double (see chart). The new surtax is based on the actual income tax paid, not one's taxable income.
