## Bush bolsters force guarding citizens, canal

WASHINGTON — President Bush, declaring "we will not be intimidated by the bullying tactics" of Gen. Manuel A. Noriega, dispatched nearly 2,000 soldiers to Panama Thursday to protect American citizens and the strategic Panama Canal.

Bush, facing the first international confrontation of his presidency, also recalled U.S. Ambassador Arthur H. Davis from Panama City and cut the staff of the U.S. Embassy there in response to Noriega's refusal to recognize an opposition victory in last Sunday's presidential election.

All U.S. military personnel, government employees and family members in Panama were placed in secure U.S. housing areas or prepared for transfer out of the country.

"I'm worried about the lives of American citizens, and I will do what is necessary to protect the lives of American citizens," the president said.

In choosing to send the troops to provide protection, but take no direct action against Noriega, Bush was walking a fine line in the escalating feud with the Panamanian dictator. He sought to demonstrate a decisive stand against election fraud and violence in a nation crucial to U.S. strategic interests, without inflaming regional sensitivity to U.S. interference in Latin American affairs.

Bush, in his remarks, repeatedly emphasized that his administration was acting in cooperation with U.S. allies in the area and with the Panamanian people who, he said, defeated Noriega's candidate in an election that the government has since nullified.

"Latin American leaders have condemned this election fraud," he said, citing reports by U.S., Latin and European observers that opposition presidential candidate Guillermo Endara was the clear victor of the poll.

Further, he said, "The crisis in Panama is a conflict between Noriega and the people of Panama. The United States stands with the Panamanian people. We share their hope that the Panamanian Alfonso Frosas will stand with them and fulfill their constitutional obligation to defend democracy."

The White House reported no attacks on Americans in Panama Thursday, but cited the recent outbreaks of political violence and the harassment of servicemen by Panamanian police in deciding on the security precautions.

"The measures, announced by Bush in a television appearance in the White House press room, won wide support from congressional leaders.

"This is a measured, careful response designed to protect American lives and to convey our interest in the events in Panama," said Sen. Alan Cranston, D-Calif., one of the lawmakers summoned to a conference with the president several hours before the announcement. Senate Majority Leader George Mitchell, D-Maine, Senate Minority Leader Bob Dole, R-Kan., and others expressed similar approval.

The new troops dispatched — 990 soldiers from Fort Ord, Calif., 725 soldiers from Fort Polk, La., and 465 Marines from Camp Lejeune, N.C. — will join 10,000 U.S. military men and women already stationed at American S. bases in Panama.

The troops would begin to move by air within the next 24 hours, Pentagon spokesman Dan Howard said. He said it would take 70 flights to get the troops to Panama.

## EPA ready to impose ban on use of Alar

WASHINGTON — The Environmental Protection Agency said Thursday it expects within 10 days to begin formal steps to ban use of the apple-ripening agent Alar.

The banning process could take as long as three years.

Earlier in the day, the trade organization representing processors of apple products, citing slumping sales, urged an immediate announcement by the EPA that it would disallow growers from any interim use, albeit legal, of the chemical. May is the month when many orchards are sprayed.

Larry Davenport, executive director of the Processed Apples Institute, Inc., said sales of apple products such as juice and sauce are off 20 percent from the same period last year. He attributed the

decline to public fears about the use of Alar by some growers.

The EPA, the Agriculture Department and the Food and Drug Administration have all pronounced apples safe for consumption even though an estimated 5 percent of the crop is treated with small amounts of the growth regulator. Consumer groups have argued that even the small amounts pose a health risk, especially to children.

The EPA had said previously it could not justify an emergency ban of Alar, but the agency announced in February it planned within 90 days to initiate more routine procedures to eliminate its use in the future — a process that could take at least 15 months at best, and up to three years if contested. The agency said there was "incontestable" laboratory evidence that Alar has triggered cancerous tumors in test mice.

Since the February announcement, the 90-day period had elapsed without a formal rulemaking proposal. Davenport said the agency should begin the official steps now in order to send a "loud and clear signal" to dissuade growers from interim use of Alar, even though that would still be legal pending promulgation of a final rule.

Asked for comment, EPA spokesman Albert Heier said, "We are going to do it. And shortly, probably within the next 10 days."

Davenport, of the apple processors' group, noted that May is "the post-bloom season, when some growers begin spraying their orchards."

He said, "We know, and all federal government agencies have reaffirmed, that apples and apple products are safe. But with the public hysteria and misinformation surrounding this issue, it has been difficult for makers of apple juices and sauces to get the truth across about product safety."

## Minimum wage bill passes House

WASHINGTON — The House voted Thursday to raise the minimum wage to \$4.55 an hour by October 1991, leaving only a final Senate vote before the bill goes to President Bush, who has promised to veto it.

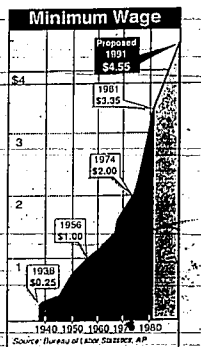
In the first major domestic policy dispute of the Bush administration, neither house of Congress has bucked down despite Bush's insistence that the minimum should be raised only to \$4.25 by January 1992 — and then only if the proposal allows employers to pay a lower "training wage" to new workers for six months.

The minimum is now \$3.35, where it has been since 1981.

The only congressional action still required is a Senate vote on the bill drafted by House-Senate negotiators, and that could come as early as next week.

There is virtually no doubt that Bush will follow through on his promise to veto the measure, and the 247-172 House vote for passage suggested the Democrats remain short of the two-thirds majority it would need to override the president.

"The House insisted on sending President Bush a bill that would cost hundreds of thousands of



Americans their opportunity to work — a bill he most certainly will veto," Labor Secretary Elizabeth Dole said shortly after the House vote.

Still, Democratic leaders in both chambers have promised to attempt an override.

"In the meantime, Democrats hope to bring public pressure on the White House by characterizing Bush's position as unfair to the working poor."

## Baker rejects talks over European nuclear arms

MOSCOW — Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev challenged the United States and its NATO allies Thursday with two bold weapons-reduction proposals as Secretary of State James A. Baker rejected negotiations over nuclear missiles in Europe.

Gorbachev offered to cut Soviet stockpiles of battlefield nuclear weapons, but Baker called the offer "a good step, ... a small step, ... a modest move to be a little less of an imbalance," Baker said, reiterating the U.S. assessment that the Soviets have a 12-1 advantage in European short-range nuclear missiles.

The official Soviet news agency said that the Soviets would withdraw 600 tactical nuclear warheads from Eastern Europe this year and that the Kremlin is prepared to pull out all nuclear munitions from Eastern Europe by 1991 if the United States engineers equivalent steps in Western Europe.

A senior U.S. official flying with Baker to Brussels and a briefing for NATO ministers said the Soviets announced they would "take" out of service this year 284 short-range missiles, 166 nuclear bombs carried aboard airplanes and 50 nuclear artillery shells.

## Prom escort fails to show, girl sues date

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. — A 15-year-old girl who says she was stood up on prom night now wants to get even.

She's suing her date for \$49,530 for her shoes, flowers and hairdo he never got to see.

Palm Beach Lakes High School junior Marlon Shadd says he called off the date a week before the dance. And besides, he says, he had a good excuse.

"She didn't believe me when I told her I fractured my ankle," Shadd said.

"This is so stupid. I'm so sick of all this. I've never heard anything so disgraceful in my whole life," his mother, Joan Bryant, said Thursday. "I offered her the money. You know what she tells me? She tells me the boy has to be punished."

The teen-agers appeared Wednesday in Palm Beach County Court after Tomonira Mangrum's mother filed a claim for the cost of the shoes, flowers and hairdo. A \$200 dress with black and white ruffles was returned unworn.

There is some dispute over the facts of the case. Ms. Bryant said her 17-year-old son, a high school basketball player, told Miss Mangrum a week before his school's April 7 formal that he would be unable to attend because he was on crutches with a fractured ankle. On prom night, he was out of town seeing a college recruiter.

But Miss Mangrum says she was stood up without notice.

"I talked to him on April 2 and he said he already had his suit and the tickets," said Miss Mangrum, a Berean Christian School student. "I was

very upset when he didn't show up."

Valerie Mangrum of Royal Palm Beach tried to track down her daughter's date on prom night.

"I called and called and called until I got his mother," she said. "She was very upset about it."

Ms. Bryant can't understand why the broken date has wound up in court.

"The problem is everybody looks to her like she's a poor, little innocent girl," she said. "He's a kid, too. He shouldn't be put in the name."

The Mangrums are demanding \$26,000 for shoes that couldn't be returned, \$23,000 for a hairdo and \$5,000 for flowers in the teen-ager's hair. Eiling the claim cost \$31,750, but if they win the July trial, Shadd may have to pay that, too.

"I don't have any money. I'm poor. Why is she doing this?" his mother asked.

## Long-term interests led to U.S. response

WASHINGTON — Faced with his first crisis as president, George Bush has decided on a measured response to the tumultuous situation in Panama, concerned that more decisive action could impair longer-term U.S. interests in the area.

"He said he was sending troops" to protect the lives of American citizens. But he ordered no direct military action and no new economic sanctions against the government of Panamanian leader Manuel Antonio Noriega.

Bush warned of the consequences of failing to send "clear signals" to the "enemies of constitutional rule" in Panama and elsewhere.

But the seven points Bush outlined indicated that if Noriega is to be overthrown, it will have to be primarily the work of Panamanians and

not Americans.

The president obviously is hoping that other democratic nations will close ranks against Noriega and that the Panamanian's resulting isolation will encourage him to move on to other pursuits.

Since Sunday's national election, a number of countries have expressed varying degrees of indignation about the irregularities reported by hundreds of international observers.

Those countries include Argentina, Guatemala, El Salvador, Peru, Costa Rica, Spain, Great Britain, West Germany and Venezuela.

And Venezuela is leading a campaign to have the Organization of American States take a strong stand for democracy in Panama.

If this fails to impress Noriega, he

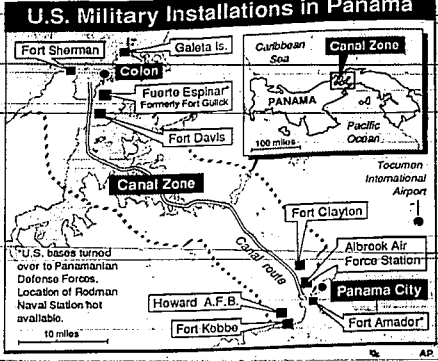

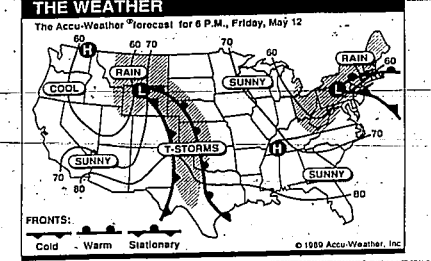

## Supreme Court blocks scheduled execution

**BOISE (AP)** — The U.S. Supreme Court issued an order Thursday blocking the scheduled Monday execution of an Idaho slayer.

Idaho officials were notified by telephone today that the Supreme Court approved a stay of execution for Bryan Lankford, while it considers his appeal.

Lankford, 28, originally from Conroe, Texas, has been sentenced to death for the July, 1983,

murders of U.S. Marine Corps Capt. Robert Bravence and his wife Cheryl, both of El Paso, Texas.

He was rescheduled to death May 1 by District Judge George Reinhardt. The next day, the Idaho Supreme Court refused to block the May 15 execution at the Idaho State Penitentiary.

Lankford's attorney, Joan Fisher of Moscow, then filed a petition with Supreme Court Justice

Sandra Day O'Connor.

On Thursday, Idaho Solicitor General Lynn Thomas said he received notice that a stay of execution was granted, "pending the timely filing and disposition by this court of a petition for a writ of certiorari (asking the U.S. Supreme Court to review lower-court action)."

If the petition is denied, the court said its stay would terminate automatically.

**New GOP state chairman emerges**  
IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Boise Cascade Vice President Randy Ayre is emerging as the likely new chairman of the state Republican Party.

Ayre, 50, a former finance chairman for the state GOP, spent the last several days meeting with party leaders around the state after becoming the only person to step forward for the top state party post being vacated on May 20 by Blake Hall of Idaho Falls.

"I'm very upbeat, and I feel good about the party," he said.

The party's central committee meets May 20 in Boise to pick a successor to Hall, who said he was stepping down to spend more time with his family and at his legal practice.

**Industry to learn how to fight back**  
IDAHO FALLS (AP) — A conference designed to teach resource-based industries in the Northwest how to fight back against overzealous environmentalists is planned May 18 in Boise.

The Northwest Federal Lands Conference is designed to convey "the belief that families whose livelihoods depend on responsible use of our natural resources can effectively fight back and win," said Tom Shaw, Caldwell. He's president of the Idaho Cattle Association, one of the sponsoring groups.

Public land users and Western multiple-use activists plan to tutor participants on effective strategies in battles with environmental groups who want to eliminate industrial and agricultural use of the Northwest's natural resources, Shaw said.

**Foundation to begin granting funds**  
BOISE (AP) — A \$500,000 grant to the Idaho Community Foundation put its total contributions over \$1 million, enabling the philanthropic group to begin granting funds by fall.

The 5-month-old foundation's largest single contribution will cover two years' operational expenses and establish a fund-bearing interest to cover those expenditures for the future.

The latest donation arrived from the Northwest Area Foundation, a private group serving eight states in the Midwest and Northwest.

**Man dies in motorcycle crash**  
NAMP (AP) — A Middleton man has died after his motorcycle crashed into a car at a Canyon County intersection.

Kenneth Wick, 35, died at the scene Wednesday afternoon after he hit the passenger-side of a car driven by Tracy Kawahara of Caldwell, Canyon County authorities said.

Wick was riding side-by-side with Rex Clayton, 31, of Caldwell. Clayton also collided with the car and was listed in stable condition at West Valley Medical Center in Caldwell.

Seven-month-old Whitney Lee, a passenger in the car, was taken by Life Flight helicopter to St. Alphonsus Regional Medical Center in Boise, where she was listed in critical condition Thursday morning with head injuries, a nursing supervisor said.

**Idaho City water still contaminated**  
IDAHO CITY (AP) — Idaho City residents will have to continue boiling their water for now because of the presence of the water-borne parasite giardia, city officials have announced.

The only remedy is to build a sand-filtered plant at a cost of up to \$500,000, money the town of 350 residents does not have, Mayor Ray Robison said Wednesday.

"This will really be bad on the city this summer with tourists," he said. "A lot won't even think about stopping here."

**Andrus names Centennial panel**  
BOISE (AP) — Delbert Farmer of the Shoshone-Bannock Tribal Office, Fort Hall, is among three new appointments to the Idaho Centennial Commission.

Gov. Cecil Andrus announced the appointments on Thursday. Also named to the commission are John Franzen, executive assistant to the president of Boise State University and Les Purce of Pocatello.

Andrus also reappointed other members of the commission which is supervising the observance of 100 years of statehood culminating on July 3, 1990. All terms end on May 15, 1991.

Three former governors continue as honorary co-chairmen of the commission. They are Robert E. Smylie, Boise; Don W. Samuelson, Sandpoint and John V. Evans, Burley.

Reappointed as commission chairman was Wallace businessman Harry Magnuson and Martin Peterson, Boise, is vice chairman.

Other members are Alvin Andrus, Rexburg; Aldrich Bowler, Bliss; J. **Deer Flat Dam repair irks farmers**  
NAMP (AP) — Southwestern Idaho farmers are questioning a \$29 million federal repair plan for Deer Flat Dam on Lake Lowell, complaining about their share of the bill and the prospect of significantly reduced irrigation water during construction.

Some 150 people turned out for a public meeting on the proposal this week, bombarding Bureau of Reclamation officials with questions about the project to restore the 80-year-old earthen dam's structural integrity.

**McClure may run**  
IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Republican Sen. James McClure may have erased much of the doubt whether he will seek a fourth term.

He announced Wednesday he has hired his former campaign coordinator, Al Henderson of Boise, to direct his re-election effort in 1990.

McClure hasn't formally declared whether he will seek re-election next year. But Henderson said the latest news shows that McClure "definitely" is gearing up.

"I'm pleased that Al will be coming back on board to work with my campaign committee," McClure said in a prepared statement.

## Kimberly should plan for a future of quality education

Evelyn Jones, Clerk of the Hansen District, has raised some questions about the bond election for the Middle School. As the Citizens Committee that studied and endorses this proposal we want to respond to her letter and clear up some misconceptions.

1) Kimberly residents pay more than others for education. Response - Kimberly school District spends \$2946 per student. Hansen spends \$3136 and Twin Falls spends \$2370.

Because we are a small district, our patrons do have to pay more than citizens in large or wealthy districts. We are proud of the support that our citizens have provided over the years. Quality education is a high priority of our people.

2) Would we need a middle school if we didn't accept out-of-district students? Our out-of-district students bring in more money than the district. The state support is based on the number of students attending the school. We receive about \$80,000 a year in state money for these students.

Even if all of our out-of-district students were refused admission, we would still have the same number of classrooms. We would just have less money from the state.

We don't have enough out-of-district students in any one grade to eliminate a classroom. Having these extra students also makes it possible for us to have additional class offerings at the junior and senior high levels. We are proud that parents and students choose our district. Apparently, they feel we are doing a good job of educating young people.

3) Should we be charging these students tuition? We are already receiving \$80,000 for these students from the state. Twin Falls has stopped charging tuition, because they found it too difficult to collect.

4) Have the supplemental and emergency levies been necessary? Supplemental and emergency levies have been used for one-time expenditures. We have felt that we must maintain our buildings and grounds. We need to have safe buses and a safe facility. We have spent money on energy conservation. The supplemental level has been passed by the patrons for the last fifteen years and an accounting of the money has always been available.

5) Since Kimberly has never been warned by the accreditation teams for overcrowding, do we need more space? Our school district is one of three in the state that has been accredited by both the Northwest Accreditation Program and the State. We are proud of this. We don't want to have our accreditation in jeopardy because of overcrowding. We hope our school will continue to plan for the future before problems become a crisis. One of the educational advantages that Kimberly offers our students is a small class size where students can get individual help.

6) Will we be too far in debt if we pass this bond? The \$920,000 that we owe on the grade school will be paid in nine years. The new bond is for 17 years.

How much debt is too much? That is a matter of perspective. However, our Kimberly School's cash reserves are higher now than in the past five years. Plant facilities and buses are in better shape than ever before. In the past, the district had to borrow money just to operate. This has not happened during the past five years.

We believe the School District and the School Board are conservative, realistic individuals that have done an excellent job managing the money. If we postpone building, it will simply cost more in the future.

7) Will there be a lot of additional expenses after the school is built? The bond includes all furniture and equipment. There will be no additional costs. The building is designed for heat efficiency and easy maintenance. It will certainly be less expensive to operate than trailers. The teaching staff will come from the elementary and the junior high. Additional staff won't be hired until the enrollment warrants.

8) Should we buy another portable instead? This is a possibility. However, portables are not good long-range investments. They simply wear out. They are expensive to heat. Custodial and maintenance costs are higher. The Middle School concept is so much more conducive to good education. Putting the sixth, seventh and eighth graders together is

good educational procedure.

The junior high students don't belong with the high school students and all the social pressures that entails. This grouping puts children of the same age, maturity and development together in all three schools. It relieves the overcrowding in the junior and senior high as well as the elementary with just one facility. It alleviates crowding and other problems on the playground. It gives the children in this age group a sense of identity and belonging.

9) Should we be obligating ourselves for another 20 years? This is always a serious consideration. Fortunately, our parents and grandparents had enough faith in the future and in our area to support the school through good times and bad. They believed in quality education and were willing to make the sacrifices to attain it. We want to do the same for our children and future generations.

The Kimberly Schools Ad Hoc Advisory Committee consists of 15 citizens from the community. The chairman is James Wright.

WASHINGTON — If U.S. companies are really worried about this country's retreat in international markets, there is one obvious thing they can do about it. Commit themselves to reducing their dependence on foreign suppliers.

Of course, this is far more easily said than done. But saying it is beginning discussion among U.S. corporate executives about the possibility of such a commitment — may be the first step toward a needed correction in this country's industrial structure.

American firms have not turned to foreign suppliers for lack of patriotism. They did it because European and Asian producers offered better quality, faster delivery, lower prices and, increasingly, more advanced technology. This openness to foreign sources has, additionally, put competitive pressure on domestic producers, restrained inflation and introduced new flexibility into the American economy — all of which, in turn, seems to have reduced our vulnerability to recession.

But pursuit of these benefits from foreign sourcing seems to have reached — indeed passed — the point of diminishing returns. What started as a more or less orderly retreat from low-valued-added, low-

tech production has now turned into a total rout at the outer reaches of high technology. Curiously, it is a Japanese corporate leader, Sony's Akio Morita, who has been most outspoken in concern that America is becoming overly dependent on foreign sources for key technology.

Morita, who has long warned about the "hollowing out" of American industry — its creeping acceptance of the role of final assembler and marketer for American consumers — recently raised the subject in a meeting at the Japanese consulate in New York with American Express CEO James D. Robinson, Blackstone Group Chairman Peter G. Peterson, international consultant Henry Kissinger and Washington Post Co. Chairman Katharine Graham.

While the U.S. trade imbalance is still heavily weighted by automobiles and consumer goods, Morita pointed out that the fastest-growing imports are sophisticated machine tools and components — the building blocks of industrial strength. This pattern threatens not only further losses of high-productivity jobs, but also the impetus for innovation that flourishes best around the actual

production process.

American firms, notes a report from the MIT Commission on Industrial Productivity, have become vulnerable to defeat. The sequence of losses, writes the authors of "Made in America: Regaining the Productive Edge," have "followed a stylized pattern."

American firms — with their eye on their stock prices and the value of executive options — set high goals for short-term return on investment. Foreign firms take advantage of that focus to "select a market segment and by aggressive pricing force down the return on investment while building market share. Within a short period the American firms retreat from the market segment. The foreign firms then move on to set aggressive prices in some other segment and the Americans once again retreat."

Already this dependence on foreign suppliers is well-established. And independence will not be easy to re-establish. Still, the greatest block may well be the U.S. mindset.

## Senate panel OKs FSX plane deal

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Foreign Relations Committee voted narrowly Thursday to approve the \$7 billion FSX deal involving joint U.S.-Japanese development and production of a next-generation fighter for Japan.

On Oct. 26, the committee rejected a resolution to disapprove the deal, which has generated sharp criticism on Capitol Hill over technology and economic issues.

Action then shifted to the Senate floor, where FSX opponents voiced hope they would be able to muster majority support for the disapproval resolution despite their defeat in the committee.

Sen. Alan J. Dixon, D-Ill., said: "I am encouraged by the closeness of this vote in the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, which a week ago — considering the administration's strong push in favor of this deal — seemed out of the question."

## Wright's top assistant resigns

WASHINGTON (AP) — House Speaker Jim Wright's top assistant, who beat a woman and left her for dead 16 years ago, resigned Thursday as renewed publicity about his case burdened the speaker's fight against charges of financial misconduct.

"When I was 19 years old, I made a terrible and tragic mistake," said John P. Mack, now 35. "I wish I could rewrite the past, but unfortunately I can't," he said in a statement released by the speaker's office.

Wright, D-Texas, hired Mack as a mail clerk after Mack got out of jail in 1976 and eventually promoted him to the top House staff position. He accepted the resignation with sadness and regret, Wright said.

"I was willing to give this young man another chance, and in the intervening years I have never had occasion to regret it," Wright said in a statement. Later, talking briefly with reporters, Wright said Mack resigned without being asked.

Mack was the speaker's closest aide. Serving as executive director of the Democratic Steering and Policy Committee, Mack helped the ruling Democrats set their legislative and political agenda.

## Bush spokesman blasts Tass stance

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush's chief spokesman on Thursday criticized the Soviet news agency Tass for a dispatch blaming the United States for election disruptions in Panama.

The spokesman said it raised new questions about Soviet intentions on improving relations with the West.

Marlin Fitzwater, Bush's press secretary, called the Tass account "very disappointing."

"It certainly tends to throw cold water on many of the claims of a new thinking, a new openness in foreign relations," Fitzwater said.

Tass, in a dispatch from Panama City reporting on Sunday's nullification of elections in Panama, said the action was necessary because the opposition, "directly instigated by the United States," violated election laws and tried to rig the results.

## Iran-Contra may haunt Bush aide

WASHINGTON (AP) — During his trial, Oliver North contradicted the sworn testimony of a longtime George Bush aide who says he didn't find out until August 1986 that North was assisting the Contras.

The Bush aide, Donald Gregg, the president's nominee to be ambassador to South Korea, will face questions about the Iran-Contra affair at a confirmation hearing today before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.

North, who was convicted of three of 12 charges last week, testified during his trial that he spoke to Gregg in 1985 about the efforts of a retired CIA agent named Felix Rodriguez working in El Salvador to assist an air re-supply operation to the Contras.

Gregg testified in a sworn deposition to the congressional Iran-Contra committees in 1987 that he did not know until an August 1986 meeting with Rodriguez about North's activities.

## Power company criticizes licensing

WASHINGTON (AP) — Duke Power Co., one of the nation's most successful nuclear utilities, told Congress Thursday that newly adopted changes in the way nuclear plants are licensed fall short of what's needed to revive the industry.

The rule change by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission takes effect next Thursday. It aims to ensure that questions about the suitability of a nuclear reactor design are answered before construction begins.

Richard B. Priory, a senior vice president of Duke Power, told a House Energy and Commerce subcommittee that the new rule still leaves the door open to potential last-minute challenges that could kill a plant after it has been completed.

"The rule does not provide the stability and certainty that is necessary before Duke Power will revisit the nuclear option," he said.

# U.S. troops now protect Panama Canal

WASHINGTON (AP) — The 10,000 U.S. military troops now based in Panama hold the job of protecting the strategic Panama Canal and handling U.S. military activities in Latin America.

The service personnel are based at 10 military installations along the 50-mile long Panama Canal, which cuts a swath through the isthmus to join the Atlantic and Pacific oceans.

Their mission, mandated by the 1977 Panama Canal Treaties, is twofold: to protect the waterway and to prepare to turn it over to the Panamanians on Dec. 31, 1999. A so-called neutrality treaty, however, provides an open-ended American military presence to guarantee the "permanent" neutrality and "operation" of the canal.

The flexibility of the treaties permits the United States to deploy added troops, and "is not contrary to the treaties," Sol M. Linowitz, one of the diplomats who negotiated the treaties, said Thursday.

Linowitz said Panama's ruler, Gen. Manuel Antonio Noriega, was being "careful" to maintain the workings of the canal and he saw "no demonstrative evidence the security is threatened."

The troops from the Army, Navy and Air Force take their orders from the hiltop quarters of the U.S. Southern Command, the headquarters for American military operations in Latin America, south of Mexico. Southern, as it is called, handles a range of activities, from road-building exercises in Central America to anti-narcotics efforts in Bolivia.

Despite its stated mission to protect the canal, the U.S. military

has also used Panama to garner intelligence on the Sandinista government in Nicaragua and the leftist guerrillas fighting in El Salvador.

Since the canal treaties went into effect on Oct. 1, 1979, the military has been moving toward fulfilling its treaty obligations by slowly turning over its property to the Panamanians.

Bases turned over the Panamanian Defense Forces so far include Fort Amador and Albrook Army Air Field, both near Panama City, more than 125 military homes in the former Canal Zone, and Fort Gulick, home of the Army's School of the Americas for 35 years, which became a training school for the Panamanians. Under U.S. control, the school trained some 44,000 Latin American military personnel and was widely called "the school of the dictators" because it provided military instruction to thousands of rightist officers from Argentina, Brazil, Bolivia, El Salvador and Nicaragua.

The School of the Americas today operates at Fort Benning near Columbus, Ga.

The remaining U.S. presence in Panama includes the Jungle Operations Training Center at Fort Sherman along the Atlantic Coast, a Special Forces battalion, a military intelligence battalion, an infantry brigade, Howard Air Base, Naval operations and the Southern Command.

The Pentagon currently is making plans to move Southcom, and a selection site could come by the end of July, according to a Defense Department spokeswoman, Maj. Kathy Wood.

Seven sites for the Southern Command have been announced.

# Bush may make assault weapon ban permanent

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush has tentatively decided to make permanent his ban on importation of assault-type semiautomatic weapons as one of the parts of a crime package he is to unveil Monday, an administration source said Thursday.

Bush has not approved the final package, but it is expected to include more money for prisons, stiffer sentencing requirements for criminals who use guns, and more money for law enforcement in general, including additional agents for the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms, said the official, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

As generally outlined, Bush's approach appears to focus on cracking down on criminals. But the provision on banning semiautomatics may be the most controversial.

Gun control opponents in Congress and members of the National Rifle Association have strongly urged against a semiautomatic ban because it might be used by gun opponents to push for stiffer restrictions on all types of guns.

In mid-March, Bush ordered a ban on import of most types of semiautomatic assault-style weapons, pending a review by BATF of their suitability for sporting purposes.

Current law requires that such weapons can only be brought into the country if they are to be used for sport. The Bush administration initiated the suspension of imports, which ultimately was expanded to cover virtually all models of the semiautomatic assault firearms, at a time when

public outcry mounted against street crimes featuring such weapons.

The public opposition arose after the guns were increasingly used in drug-related shootings and after the Jan. 17 killing of five youngsters at a Stockton, Calif., by a man who used a semiautomatic.

Several administration officials want Bush to extend the ban on imports to cover domestically manufactured weapons that are very similar to the foreign models.

But the president's plan, in its preliminary stages, did not include such a measure, the official said. It was unclear how he would deal with the suitability-for-sports question in deciding on that aspect.

# Judges run greater risks from vengeful criminals

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — The bombings of two Minnesota state judges' homes 15 miles apart were connected, authorities say, and the U.S. Marshals Service says threats against federal court officials are on the rise.

Criminals "think threatening the judge will solve the problem," said Bill Dempsey, a spokesman for the Marshals Service.

"It kind of goes with the turf, unfortunately," said Olmsted County District Judge Gerard Ring, who received several death threats last year after a controversial ruling in the case of a youthful ax murderer suspect.

"I don't think there's been a judge who's been on the bench more than a couple years who hasn't had some threats or harassment of some kind," said Anoka County District Judge Lynn Olson.

"Most of us don't take it very seriously, and perhaps we ought to," said Olson, who is president of the Minnesota District Judges Association.

Authorities announced Monday that an April 26 blast that severely damaged the Blooming Prairie home of Freeborn County District Judge James Mork was caused by a bomb. The judge, his wife, and an 18-year-old son were home but escaped injury. Police Chief Terry Brodeck estimated damage at more than \$80,000.

Fifteen miles away, on May 29, 1988, an explosion and fire destroyed Mower County District Court Judge William Nierengarten's home in Austin. No one was home at the time.

Both judges serve in southeastern Minnesota's Third Judicial District.

"We can certainly link the two. There's no question of it," said Pete Mastin, special agent in charge of the St. Paul office of the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.

Steele County Sheriff Bill Hildebrandt said both explosions caused the same "crater effect" or concussion pattern, and both blew inward into the houses. Blooming Prairie's in Steele County.

There have been no arrests, and police say they know of no motive for the two bombings.

Nierengarten does not speak about the incident, his law clerk said. Mork would not comment, except to express confidence in the investigation.

"By the grace of God we survived the explosion and we are thankful for that. We intend to stand firm and move forward with our lives," Mork said.

## Nation Sales stay sluggish for April

WASHINGTON (AP) — Retail sales rose by a lackluster 0.4 percent in April, the government said Thursday in a report cited by analysts as evidence that higher interest rates are taking a toll on economic growth.

The Commerce Department said sales climbed to a seasonally adjusted \$139.9 billion last month after remaining flat in March and falling 0.4 percent in February.

The last three months' sales were up 5.2 percent over the same period last year, barely keeping pace with inflation, said economist Lawrence A. Hunter of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. "Today's report is another clear sign that the economy has slowed far more than most analysts realize."

Economists had expected a much stronger rebound in April, anticipating a surge of between 1 percent and 2 percent on the strength of higher auto sales.

Car-buying did increase for the first time since November — it was up 1.1 percent following declines of 0.5 percent and 1.8 percent — but the gain amounted to only about half of what was predicted.

Auto sales have been hit particularly hard by the Federal Reserve's strategy of pushing up interest rates to fight inflation, as have housing-related items such as hardware, building supplies and furniture.

Bond prices, which move up as interest rates move down, rose slightly in trading after the release of the sales report.

Excluding the automotive category, sales rose a sluggish 0.2 percent last month after inching up 0.1 percent in March and falling 0.1 percent in February.

The bright spots in the report were sales at department stores and specialty clothing shops, buoyed by a long-awaited rebound in sales of women's clothing.

Purchases at general merchandise and department stores were up 1.0 percent following a 0.1 percent gain in March. Clothing stores reported a large 3.6 percent gain last month, compared with a 0.5 percent drop a month earlier. It was the "biggest jump since February 1987."

## U.S. proposes cleanup fund

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Bush administration on Thursday proposed a \$500-million oil-spill cleanup fund to be financed by the oil industry, even as Transportation Secretary Samuel Skinner suggested the cost of the Alaska spill could exceed that amount.

Congress has been debating creation of such a fund for 15 years, but supporters said the effort received little attention until the tanker Exxon Valdez ran aground in March, dumping 11-million gallons of oil into the pristine waters off Alaska.

Skinner outlined the administration's proposal at a congressional hearing during which he noted that the federal government at the time of the Alaska spill had only a few million dollars available specifically for cleanup efforts.

Had that spill been caused by a company less well-to-do than the Exxon Corp., the government would have had to scramble for funds and ask Congress for tens of millions of dollars to get the cleanup effort going, Skinner told the House Subcommittee on Coast Guard and Navigation.

Estimates of the cost of the Exxon spill, the worst in U.S. history, have ranged widely, from about \$100 million to many times that amount.

Skinner said it was too early to predict the total cost, but said the amount would be substantial. He said Exxon expects to pay as much as \$750 million to workers cleaning the oil-fouled Alaska shore in the coming months.

Skinner said he took the 66-year-old congressman to the National Institutes of Health on Tuesday.

"I've talked to him every day," said James. "He's doing fine. He's anxious to get out of there."

"It was lousy," Wilson said.

She said the freezer room was locked up and the temperature monitored throughout the night to make sure it didn't rise to the point where food would spoil.

The swing shift crew started work again Thursday afternoon, she said.

**HAILEY** - Idaho First National bank officer Donald Chance told jurors this week that the financial condition of a mushroom farm in fall 1985 was not improved, as the farm has claimed, but had "deteriorated."

Chance also testified that the farm was having marketing problems in 1985 and had revenues far less than initial projections by the farm's operators.

"The financial condition of the company was continuing to deteriorate. Their financial statements were upside-down," Chance said, meaning the company's liabilities exceeded its assets. Idaho First sent a default notice to the farm that fall.

Several investors in the farm, including Dr. Fred Surbaugh, and the farm manager John Burk have testified that production was up by late 1985 and that problems were being solved.

Chances' testimony this week paints a different picture. Idaho First attorney Peter Houtama created a chart for the jury that broke down mushroom sales for 1985.

Entire sales for the year totaled just more than \$19,000.

The farm had projected mushroom revenues in 1985 of about \$8 million, according to a business plan written for the bank's credit file.

Investigators had lost faith in the project in late 1985 when they were asked to invest more money to keep the farm going, he said. "The stockholders had indicated they were not going to support the company any longer," Chance said.

The farm was struggling in its marketing efforts too, he said. Chance said he visited the site in July 1985 and saw piles of wasted mushrooms. "I was concerned," Chance said. "There were piles of mushrooms that weren't being sold, they were being dumped."

The condition of the farm in 1985 warranted the bank's default notice that fall, Chance said.

The trial pits Idaho First, now named West One Bank, against Robert Erkins and Thomas Walker Jr., partners in the farm, and 12 investors.

Idaho First filed a foreclosure notice on

the farm in March 1987, claiming it did not comply with part of its loan agreement.

Erkins, Walker and the investors counter-sued, claiming the bank forced them out of business.

Under cross-examination, Chance again said he had no knowledge of a negative report from federal banking regulators in 1985.

Officials from the Comptroller of the Currency met with Idaho First's board of directors in mid-May 1985 to discuss the bank's loan portfolio, which the regulators described as "unsatisfactory" and of serious supervisory concern," according to court documents.

"So, as you sit here today, you are telling the jury you had not reviewed any of the OCC reports that cover 1984 and 1985?" asked Ed McCabe, counsel for Bliss Valley.

"No, I had not," said Chance.

Chance testified last week he did not learn of the reports until 1988.

Bliss Valley has contended that the bank tightened its grip on the loan, after the OCC criticized the loan portfolio.





# 5 Wendell School Board seats contested

WENDELL — Because of rezoning, all five School Board positions are up for the May 16 election this year in Wendell and two zones have contested races.

In Zone 1, incumbent Elaine Daniels is running unopposed. In Zone 3, Graham Solomon is running unopposed for the seat being vacated by Jack Hirani, who is not seeking re-election. Incumbent Don Fowler, elected last year, is running unopposed in Zone 4.

In Zone 2, John Koning and Clarence Sparks are vying for the seat being vacated by Vernon Mason, who is not running for re-election.

Koning, a dairy farmer with three children in school and one pre-school child, said he is running because he cares about the quality of education in Wendell and would like to be involved in it.

"I'm for a strong academic program and a quality athletic program," Koning said. "I hope can contribute to the quality of the school district."

The board has done a good job, he said, adding, "I'm not running to make changes."

One issue that will have to be addressed is the need for more classrooms to handle the increasing number of students, Koning said. In two years, he said, the new gymnasium will be paid off and, at that time, the district should consider enlarging the present junior high and high school or building another one. "We already have the property," Koning said.

Large elementary classes now moving up will need more room than the present facilities can provide, he said.

Koning said his experience as a plant manager of a large factory in Michigan could help him in dealing with people and employees. If elected, Koning said he would spend some time at the school and learn how the system works. This, Koning said, would help him make better, intelligent decisions as a trustee.

"Also, he said, good communication among teachers, administrators and trustees is paramount if the district is going to run efficiently."

Sparks, a state employee, said he is interested in the community and would like to help it as a trustee. "I would like to see the School Board run on a smooth, even keel without any problems," Sparks said.

His goals for the Wendell School are to have a better academic program "for those kids that are achievers" and also have a better vocational program "for those that are doers."

He said he will work to do as much as possible with the district's limited funds.

"I'd really like to see a program that would fit all the students that go here," he said.

Sparks has two children in high school and another one that has already graduated.

In Zone 5, incumbent Clayton Pope is challenged by Frederick Prins.

Pope, who joined the board in 1978 and now serves as chairman, said the board needs to have some experienced members to follow through on the district's long-range goals.

Communications among administrators, teachers and trustees are better now than they have been in a long time, Pope said, and I think we can still improve them."

Pope, a farmer, blacksmith and construction worker, said the district's lines of communication must be open, and patrons of the district are welcome to talk to him at anytime. Pope is also a supervisor of the West Point Highway District. He has nine children. Four have graduated and the rest are still coming through," he said.

An upcoming school issue, Pope said, is the need for more classrooms in Wendell to handle the district's increasing enrollment. "I'd like to look at the possibility of a building program," he said.

Prins, an optometrist in Twin Falls, said "some things need changing" and it is time for new people to be on the Wendell school board.

"Quite a few people asked me to run again," said Prins, who made an unsuccessful bid about seven years ago. "I'm not running because there are any problems. I just think it's time for a change."

There are no definite issues this year, he said. Some of the buildings are getting old and that has to be taken care of, he added.

Prins said the administration is changing this year with a new superintendent, "so it may not be a bad idea to have new board members." I think now is the time for a change."

Prins has a ranch southeast of Wendell and has served on the Wendell Recreation Board and on church boards. Four of his children have graduated and one is in fifth grade.

"People should come out and vote and put democracy to work," Prins said.

Church would help him be a qualified trustee.

## Flap over water develops in Utah

**OGDEN, Utah (AP)**—Warning the Salt Lake City area against a regional water grab, Utah North-Mission 2000 has denounced any attempt by the state to trade high-quality mountain water from Northern Utah for lower-elevation water of lesser quality.

The non-profit strategic planning group on Wednesday unanimously approved a statement by its land and water resources task force that discourages any exchange of water of unequal quality with other areas of the state.

Larry Anderson, director of the Utah Division of Water Resources, said he has never heard of Mission 2000 and he declined to comment on its statement.

"We could not support the exchange of high-elevation water for low-elevation water from the Willard Bay Reservoir," the statement said.

Mission 2000 generally supports a Utah Division of Water Resources draft of a state water plan for future water supplies, but finds the state's plans for Northern Utah water users "vague at best," said Cyrus McKell, chairman of Mission 2000's physical resources council.

The plan needed "a little more meat on it" about retaining rights to eastern-bench water for Northern Utah consumers, he said.

Ivan Flint, general manager of the Weber Basin Water Conservancy District, said he agrees with Mission 2000's position.

"We don't want to ever trade upstream water and suggest people in our district use lower-quality water," he said.

# Official criticizes Nicaragua election plan

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush's nominee to be ambassador to the Organization of American States said Thursday that Nicaragua's Sandinista government has "not met the standards of legitimacy" in the first phase of preparations for elections next year.

"There were in fact no direct negotiations between the Sandinistas and the internal opposition groups over the content of the reforms that were to be made," Luigi Einaudi, director of policy planning for the State Department's Bureau of Inter-American Affairs, testified at a hearing.

"Rather, these were in effect imposed by the Sandinistas," Einaudi said.

Einaudi was among final witnesses in three days of hearings by the Commission on a Free and Fair Election in Nicaragua, a bipartisan panel supported by private donations that will come up with suggested guidelines for the February balloting. The commission was established by the conservative World Freedom Foundation.

The commission also heard from Keith E. Schuette, president of the National Republican Institute for International Affairs, which, with its Democratic counterpart, sponsored the Panamanian election observation team headed by former Presidents Carter and Ford.

After observing the elections in that country, Schuette said, "the lessons we have drawn have important applicability to developments in Nicaragua."

"Our experience is that the quality and intention of an electoral law is but one element of the critical determinants of whether an election will be free and fair," he testified.

"The other two points of analysis are the caliber and organization of the opposition and the overall organization of government."

"There are disturbing parallels, too frequent to be considered accidental, between these three elements in the cases of Nicaragua and Panama," he said.

He said he had concluded that "sufficient freedom of organization, expression and activity does not

currently exist to ensure a free and fair election in Nicaragua."

That view was echoed by Einaudi, who said the United States was "very concerned" that the first stage of preparations for the election "has in fact not met what we would consider standards of legitimacy."

He said the Sandinistas appeared to have shown "a complete unwillingness to open the system further" when they empowered President Daniel Ortega to name all five members of an electoral commission made up of two Sandinista members, two opposition members and a neutral member.

Ortega's naming of a neutral member in reality will make the commission an automatic Sandinista rubber stamp, Einaudi said.

He added, however, that he is "cautiously optimistic" that the Sandinistas may make changes to make the electoral system more palatable.

Curtin Winsor, former Reagan administration ambassador to Costa Rica and co-chairman of the commission, said that although Einaudi is the ambassador-designate to the OAS he was testifying in his current State Department capacity.

## Britain updates secrets act

LONDON (AP) — Britain's new Official Secrets Act got the royal seal of approval Thursday, even though it has been denounced by critics as a government assault on the public's right to know.

Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher's government called it an improvement on the original 1911 act, which contained 200 different ways of charging someone with revealing official information, however trivial, without authorization.

Critics said the new law's major flaw is that it denies officials who leak information about improper or questionable government conduct the defense that they acted in the public interest or that the information has already been published elsewhere.

The law received the Royal Assent, a final formality before taking effect later this year. The Home Office said no date has been announced.

The 1911 law, hastily passed during a German spy scare, has given Britain the reputation of being one of the most secretive Western

democracies.

Technically it covered everything from the civil service's tea intake to the fertilizer applied to Buckingham Palace's flowerbeds.

Home Secretary Douglas Hurd said the new legislation "removes from criminal sanction the unauthorized disclosure of large quantities of official information, substantial as well as trivial, including disclosures which might merely embarrass or inconvenience the government of the day."

Introduced after months of debate, the new law codifies the government's right to secrecy in six specified areas covering defense, the security services, crime prevention and detection, and international relations.

The only automatic offenses will be leaving or publicizing security service bugging, telephone tapping and mail interception.

In other cases of unauthorized disclosures, prosecutors will have to prove a "damaging disclosure" has been made about a branch of government.

### Israelis protest death of soldier

JERUSALEM (AP) — Army troops fatally shot a Palestinian teenager Thursday, while hundreds of Israelis screaming "Death to the Arabs!" stoned Arab-owned cars in an angry protest over the slaying of a soldier.

Palestinians staged a general strike in the occupied territories to mourn the 470 Arabs killed in the 17-month uprising against Israeli rule. Twenty-one Israelis also have been killed.

In Bethlehem, activists blocked roads with rocks, hung outlawed Palestinian flags from electricity poles, and covered walls with graffiti saying "No to Shamir's Elections!"

Government officials said, meanwhile, that Israel's coalition government remains split on party lines about how to conduct elections in the occupied West Bank and Gaza Strip, despite U.S. pressure for a detailed proposal.

In southern Israel, hundreds of people waving anti-Arab banners and Israeli flags marched near the port city of Ashkelon to protest the slaying of an army sergeant and the disappearance of a second soldier.

Demonstrators stoned several Arab-owned cars, and at one point menaced two terrified Arab pedestrians who were rescued by police.

### Tornado kills 5 in central China

BEIJING (AP) — A tornado accompanied by heavy rain and hail killed five people and injured 157 in central China's Anhui province, the official Xinhua News Agency reported Thursday.

The tornado Wednesday toppled 1,800 homes and flooded about 1,000 acres of farmland, it said.

Harsh weather has caused heavy casualties in China this spring. Hailstorms killed 157 people in southwestern China's Sichuan province in April and seven in northeast Guizhou province.

MOSCOW (AP) — The volcano named for Ivan the Terrible is roaring again after long years of silence, Tass reported Thursday.

Ash and gas spewed from the rumbling volcano on Iturup, the largest island in the Kuriles in the Soviet Far East, the official news agency said.

Although specialists say that "Ivan the Terrible only has a slight cough," authorities are prepared to evacuate the local population, Tass said.

Ivan is one of four islands that are the subjects of a territorial dispute between the Soviet Union and Japan. The Soviets occupied the islands in 1945 after the end of World War II.

The original Ivan-the-Terrible, who ruled Russia in 1544-84, earned his name with his fiery rages and bloody massacres. In one of his fits of temper he killed his own son, breaking the royal succession and paving the way for years of anarchy.

### Beirut tries another cease-fire

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Christians and Syrians stopped shooting Thursday after the Arab League proclaimed a fifth cease-fire in its effort to end two months of artillery duels that have shattered and paralyzed Beirut.

The league's four previous calls for a halt to the shelling had little effect on the battle between Gen. Michel Aoun's Christian army units and a Muslim alliance of Syrian troops and Druse militiamen.

Police reported 20 people killed and 62 wounded by rockets, howitzer shells and mortar fire before the truce deadline Thursday afternoon, bringing total casualties to 357 dead and 1,385 wounded since the fighting began March 8. Nearly all the casualties have been civilians.

### China to welcome Gorbachev speech

BEIJING (AP) — Leaders of China's pro-democracy student movement announced Thursday they would invite Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev to speak on political reform in his country when he arrives Monday.

Protest leaders also said they were planning the first "coming ceremony" for the Soviet president, who will be the first Soviet leader to visit China in 30 years.

"We have not ruled out a demonstration to express our support for political reform," said one activist, who has helped lead seven marches since mid-April for democracy and a free press.

Students said they wanted Gorbachev to speak at Beijing University, China's most prestigious college.

On Thursday night, students collected 1,200 signatures on an open invitation to Gorbachev. Organizers said they hoped most of the university's more than 10,000 students would sign by Saturday, when the invitation will be delivered.

Added Lorie: "Joel Silver (the producer) has a track record for tapping into the heartland of America. Critics may not always approve, but the moviegoers do."

### ABC and CBS plan TV movies on child molestation

**HOLLYWOOD** — Both ABC and CBS are preparing TV movies on the subject of preschool child molestation with satanic ritual overtones.

Casting is under way on CBS' fictional "O Do You Know the Muffin Man," set to begin production May 25, with Jon Avnet producing; Gil Gates directing. Gates said that "Muffin Man" focuses on a couple who discover "one of their children has had a certain experience" at preschool, and called the script "very special" and not at all lurid. ## Videos gain popularity in Twin Falls

### Most movie-watchers look for comedies

**TWIN FALLS** — On any given Saturday in Twin Falls, more than 5,000 videos and Nintendo games are rented, taken home and plugged into television sets.

It's like clockwork, a reliable indicator the weekend has arrived. And it ensures that people like Bob Watts and Mike Howard, owners of two of Twin Falls' larger video stores, stay in business.

Great American Videos and Video West pump out 2,500 over a Saturday — a rough estimation of videos rented by outlets such as grocery stores, conveniences stores and other outlets scurrying for a piece of the lucrative video pie by an employee at Video West easily doubles that number.

The hottest thing to hit the video industry is the Nintendo entertainment system, says Watts and Howard.

More Nintendo games go out each week in terms of percent, than movies. At an average purchasing cost of \$35 each, renting a Nintendo game before buying it makes sense to a lot of his customers, says Howard, owner of Great American.

Nintendo machine and game rentals are primarily done by the younger set, says Watts, who owns Video West. But, he adds, "If they (adults) are like me, they've never made one easy enough to play."

Video West stocks 130 Nintendo games and 4,500 movies. Great American Video stocks 8,000 movies and 200 Nintendo games.

While kids are emptying the Nintendo shelves, people of all ages are renting the movies. People in the 20- to 30-year-old group rent the most.

And the most popular movies in the valley? There's no contest, it's comedies all the way. "I think it's because people like to watch something funny to get their mind off everything else," explains Watts. "The business is a 'new-release driven business and those are always the most popular,' he says. Currently the most asked-for video in town is 'Cocktail' with Tom Cruise.

"Every single person that walks in this door wants 'Cocktail,'" says Cheryl Johnson, manager of Hotspot Video in the Lynwood Mall, which stocks 2,000 videos. The popularity of "Cocktail" spurred an interest in other Tom Cruise movies, just as the recent theater showing of "Rain Man" with Cruise and Dustin Hoffman also spurred an interest in their earlier works.

## Suzuki violin students schedule benefit concert

**TWIN FALLS** — More than 100 young Suzuki violin students will be on stage Monday night in the "Spring String Thing" — a performance that's both recital and fund-raiser. As a recital, the 114 Magic Valley violinists (ages three through 18) will be playing classics and folk tunes by Bach, Mozart, and Brahms.

As a fund-raiser, the concert will benefit Tracie O'Gorman and Amber Thacker, two local girls who have needed liver transplants.

Admission will be by donation, with funds channeled through the Magic Valley Children's Medical

Fund. O'Gorman, a 19-year-old Twin Falls resident, received a new liver in March; Thacker, 14, is still on the waiting list for a transplant. Each transplant costs between \$15,000 and \$25,000, according to MVMCF coordinator Pam Dowd; the fund is about \$2,500 short of its goal of raising \$7,500 each for O'Gorman and Thacker.

Monday's recital is a "culmination of the year's work," says Juliene Slaughter, director of the local Suzuki association. She is convinced that offering the recital as a benefit gives it a richer meaning for the young musicians. And such benevolence fits with the Suzuki philosophy that

music can make children "more noble spirits," she adds. Japanese-born Suzuki developed his innovative instruction style shortly after the Second World War devastated his country. The son of a violin maker, Suzuki believed music could restore hope and faith among Japanese children.

In the Suzuki method, imitation is a key to learning music, just as in learning a language. Students learn to handle the violin and produce sounds long before they are taught to read music.

The youngest students may play for a couple of years before learning to read notes on a printed page. Slaughter describes the Suzuki

method as "a philosophy of teaching that is so different from other methods of teaching, with greater emphasis on memorization and numerous innovative learning techniques. Teacher, student and parents work together in the 'learning triangle' that is key to Suzuki training," Slaughter explains.

Parents not only assist with at-home practice sessions, but attend rehearsals, workshops and "play-ins." Students help one another; when first-learning their Suzuki repertoire, students perform in groups. Piano, cello, flute and harp are also taught by Suzuki methods. Slaughter has been teaching Suzuki's methods to violin students since

1963. Monday's concert will include students of five other Magic Valley Suzuki instructors: Linda Seaman, Judy Call and Christina Hanks of Twin Falls; Joene Holson of Burley and Sheila Allen of Piler.

Saturday, local Suzuki students will gather at CSI for a dress rehearsal and workshop — and a chance to visit with Amber Thacker, one of the recipients of their Monday night recital. Amber and Tracie are only two of the 22 children who have benefited from the Magic Valley Children's Medical Fund since it was established six years ago. The first recipient was two-year-old Pamela Allen, who faced a devastating liver condi-

tion and exorbitant medical bills. When Pamela died just six months later, remaining funds were put in a trust fund for children age 19 and under who face life-threatening medical conditions. Since then, the fund has helped pay for heart monitors, critical tests, liver transplants and outpatient therapy for children throughout the eight-county area. Lew Lenker, Twin Falls, is coordinating the connection between Suzuki Parents' Association Board and Magic Valley Children's Medical Fund. As father of two Suzuki students, Lenker is inspired by his kids' musical progress as well as the concert's outreach.

The program will include Leonore Overture, No. 3, by Beethoven; Symphony, No. 4, "Italian" by Mendelssohn; Trampet Concerto with Nick Norton on the trumpet by Hummel; and Polovstian Dances from "Prince Igor" by Borodin.

The 85-member symphony will be directed by Christopher Wilkins. He joined Utah Symphony in 1986 as associate conductor after three years as Exxon/Arts Endowment Conductor with the Cleveland Orchestra. Wilkins received his Master of Music degree in 1981 from Yale University, as a student of Otto-Werner Mueller. He earned his bachelor's degree from Harvard College in 1978 where he was music director of the Bach Society Orchestra. As an adult, Wilkins performed with many ensembles in the Boston area. Wilkins has been a guest conductor with many leading orchestras, including the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the San Francisco Symphony, the Dallas Symphony and the Rochester Philharmonic.

The Utah Symphony's first season in 1940 consisted of five concerts performed by 52 part-time musicians. The orchestra now presents more than 250 concerts annually.

Music Director Laureate Maurice Abravanel is credited with guiding the Utah Symphony from relative obscurity in 1947, to national and international prominence during his 32 years as music director. He was preceded by Hans Heniet, who led the initial concerts, and by Werner Janssen, who conducted during the 1946-47 season.

Early in her career, Sledd needed fancy dresses for various singing jobs. At prices she could afford, Sledd made her own, by trial and error, copying ready-made clothes.

While raising her son, she went back to her sewing and gradually made a name for herself as a talented designer. One red lace dress with chiffon ruffles to the floor was custom made for Barbara Mandrell to wear on a nationally televised music award show. Other stars picked up Sledd's fashions because they were durable, washable and could be piled in the closet of a bus

"I've found lace for \$1.50 a yard that was not as good as what I could take for \$5.98 and set my own sequins in and make it pretty," she said.

But the yen to be a professional singer returned, and Sledd recently gave up her designing business to return to the stage. Jeb, now 12 years old, stays with his grandparents and travels with his mother when school is out.

Sledd's husband, Van Barker, is also her agent. His main work is booking Grand Ole Opry stars to play in the Northwest.

Starting over has not been easy, Sledd admits. "I had a lot of momentum going that I didn't think about until now. I realize how hard it is to get back. I never had the

hit records to be household word."

This month, Sledd recorded a new album and plans to release a single from it. A video she made for one of her songs, "Don't Stay if You Don't Love Me," has played on TNN, a national television station broadcast from Nashville. She has also appeared on the Ralph Emery Show and the Shotgun Red show on television.

Rushing said Sledd is talented and has a good following in the Nashville area, but she isn't widely known elsewhere.

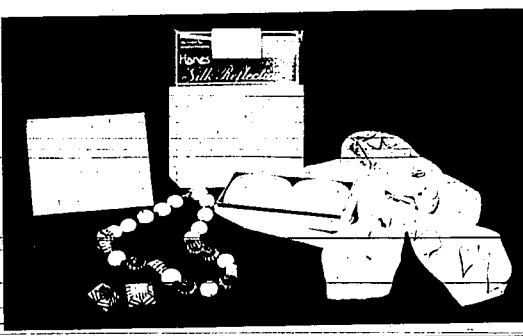
Sledd said she has returned to touring full-time to get her singing career back on the road.

"I only sew for myself now," she added, and for thankful that I can.



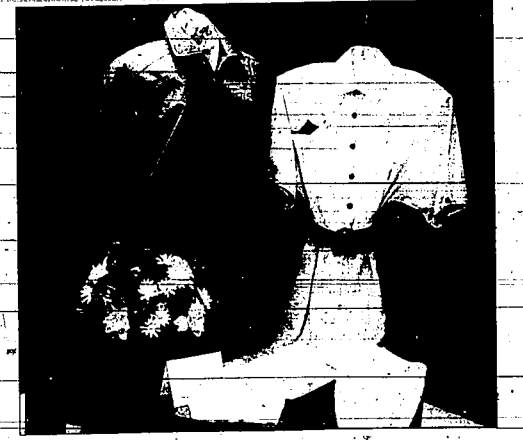
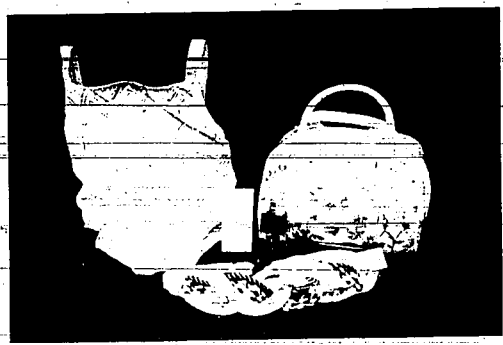

## Actress battles cancer for second time

LOS ANGELES (AP) — It started again, Jill Ireland recalls ruefully, just two months before the five-year milestone when she would finally be considered free of cancer.

In 1984, the blond, English-born actress-producer underwent surgery for removal of her right breast and right lymph nodes under her right arm. During the six months of chemotherapy she wrote a book about her ordeal, "Life Wish," which became a best-seller.

She and her husband, tough-guy actor Charles Bronson, resumed their lives, and she co-produced his film, "Murphy's Law," and co-starred with him in "Assassination." Then in April 1988, she felt pain just above her collarbone. It was treated with local radiation.

"After that, my whole shoulder began to be excruciatingly painful and would swell up," she recounted from her hotel room in Arlington, Tex., where she is undergoing intense treatment. "I began losing the use of my right arm."

"I kept being told by the doctors that it was the result of radiation. It got very bad, and I developed a bad cough. They discovered I had cancer in my lungs. Then they discovered I had cancer in my femur, my hip and my thyroid."

"I had been given the Betty Ford Award here two years ago by the Komien Foundation. I came back last year, even though I didn't feel very well, because Nan-

cy Reagan was receiving it. When I was here, I met a doctor, George Blumenshein, who said, 'If you've had a recurrence of cancer; what are you doing about it. I said radiation. He didn't say very much, but silence can say quite a lot.'

Her condition worsened, and she recalled meeting the doctor from the Arlington Cancer Center. She called him, and was on the jet to Dallas the next day.

"He X-rayed everything—and showed me where everything was," Miss Ireland continued. "He suggested putting a catheter into a valve going into my heart, and he started very, very heavy doses of chemotherapy."

"Unfortunately, it didn't work, so I came back. What they're doing now is hyperthermia—it's an all-day thing. I go to the hospital at 9 in the morning, and I'm there until 7 in the evening."

The hyperthermia involves injecting 9-inch metal skewers into her shoulder and heating them to 160 degrees in an attempt to burn the tumors. She also is undergoing radiation and chemotherapy.

Miss Ireland said laughingly that she hoped her renewed illness wouldn't upstage her new book. Among other things, "Life Lines" deals with another painful subject: her ordeal with her adopted son, Jason, who fell victim to drug and alcohol abuse. He is one of Miss Ireland's seven children.

## Successful 'Golden Girls' tapes 100th show

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Susan Harris says "The Golden Girls" began with a suggestion that she write about a group of older women in Miami.

But when the "suggestion" comes from Brandon Tartikoff, a president of NBC Entertainment, it's a little hard to dismiss.

"I hadn't wanted to do any more television," said Harris, who had created "Soap" and "Benson."

"But that appealed to me. I like writing about older people. They have more to say. They've led rich lives. That's really how it started. After that I came up with the concept and the characters. We got the stars we wanted."

The 100th episode of "The Golden Girls" aired May 6. The Emmy-winning series just completed its third season. It was fifth in the Nielsen ratings for the season. Another Harris creation, "Empty Nest," a spinoff of "The Golden Girls," was in ninth place.

"The Golden Girls" are four women living in retirement in the same house in Miami. Bea Arthur plays Dorothy Zornak, a no-nonsense former schoolteacher whose husband

left her for a younger woman; Betty White is Rose Nylund, a naive, widowed grief counselor; Rue McClanahan plays Blanche Devereaux, an aging Southern coquette; and Estelle Getty is Dorothy's mother, Sophia Petrillo, whose uncontrollable bluntness was caused by a stroke.

"Estelle Getty was the only unknown when we started casting," said Harris. "She came in, read the part and in two minutes we said, 'That's it.'"

The cast of the pilot also included a gay houseboy, but he was reluctantly dropped when the roles of the four women proved to be much richer than expected.

"The contrast between the four women breeds the conflict," said Harris. "We had to make them quite different or you'd end up with 30 minutes of 'nice.' Dorothy comes from Queens. She's the most outspoken, the sharpest, the strongest character. She's a survivor. Rose is not quite in the world. She's been protected all her life, so there's a bit of the ingenue about her. She's an innocent, a bit like Jessica in 'Soap.'"

"Blanche is a throwback to the Old South. She's antebellum. She's Scar-

lett O'Hara. She thinks she's hot stuff, but she's growing older and is having a tough time. Sophia is an Italian mother who spent a lot of time in New York. She's a tough cookie. We gave her a small stroke that wiped out her brain censor so she could say what everyone else would like to say but doesn't."

Harris said she believes there's lots of life left in the "Girls" and that the award-winning show can go on for many more years.

Harris confines her writing these days to motion pictures. "My husband calls me the creator-deserter," she said. After "Soap," she married Paul Witt of Witt-Thomas Productions, makers of "The Golden Girls" and "Empty Nest."

She no longer writes episodic TV because for four years she wrote every script for "Soap."

"I will never, ever do that again," she said. "I had to give up my life to do that. It was a nightmare. I never stopped working. I couldn't get sick. I worked day and night. I'll never do that again. My son was 9 or 10 at the time, and I didn't get to see much of him."

"It's a tradeoff. Before 'Soap' I

lived in a tiny house in the Valley. I discussed it with my son. I said this was a way to buy a house. So when he was 14, he had a nice house with a swimming pool. I don't regret it. It gave me a chance to be more creative than I'd ever been."

Harris said she now works slowly. She also takes plenty of time out to spend with her family, which now includes a new baby.

Before she began writing she was a housewife who held a number of different jobs.

"I began writing the way a lot of people do," she said. "I was watching TV one night and it was such garbage. I said I could write better than that. I got a copy of a teleplay and used it as a guide. I sold the first thing I wrote, a script for 'Then Came Bronson.'"

After that she wrote for "All in the Family," "Maude" and other comedies, then created "Fay."

Harris is still angry about the fate of "Soap." She said it was the victim of misinformation and was canceled after four years on the air because of pressure from conservative groups who thought it too risqué.

# 'See No Evil' is perfect comedy

**HOLLYWOOD** — "Big" proved last year that a movie can follow those with similar themes and still succeed. "Like Father, Like Son," "Vice Versa" and "18 Again" had all explored the comedy of age transference. Tom Hanks was so inspired in the hilarious "Big" that the movie ended up selling more than twice as many tickets as the other three combined.

A month ago, "Dream Team" hit the market with rollicking tale of four escaped mental patients who solve a murder in Manhattan. Is there a chance for another movie about handicapped people who solve a murder in Manhattan?

The answer is a resounding yes. "See No Evil, Hear No Evil" is a perfect comedy, brilliantly conceived and superbly executed by two comic artists at the peak of their talents.

# 'The 'Burbs' is letdown for Tom Hanks fans

The following are capsule reviews of some of the films now playing in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and the Los Angeles Times. Opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

**THE 'BURBS** (PG). Grimly unfunny comedy about three suburban husbands (Tom Hanks, Bruce Dern and Rick Ducommun) who behave like little boys when a Munsterlike family moves in a ramshackle Victorian house on their cul-de-sac. Big letdown for fans of Hanks, freshly Oscar nominated for "Big." With Carrie Fisher, Corey Feldman.

**CRIMINAL LAW** (R). Gary Oldman is electrifying as a brash Boston attorney who successfully defends rich aristocrat Kevin Bacon on a murder charge only to become convinced he's a budding serial rapist-murderer. Unfortunately, the film itself is routine and obvious.

**DISORGANIZED CRIME** (R). Pleasant but needlessly drawn-out caper comedy in which an ill-assorted bunch of crooks (Fred Gwynne, Ruben Blades, Lou Diamond Phillips, William Russ) attempt to rob a bank in a small Montana town, despite their leader (Corbin Bernsen) being chased by a pair of New Jersey cops (scene-stealers Ed O'Neill and Dan Roebuck). Written and directed by Jim Kouf, who also wrote "Stakeout."

**THE DREAM TEAM** (PG-13). Howard Zieff's new comedy is so clearly derived from the movie "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest" that you might begin to wonder when Jack Nicholson will show up. This amiably slick farce stars Michael Keaton; Christopher Lloyd and Peter Boyle as a carnivorous funny trio with Stephen Furst playing the weakest role, although he has a great comic waddle, running along helplessly behind them like a chafed turtle.

**HEATHERS** (R). A film that thinks of itself as black comedy; certainly some of the targets in Daniel Waters' script are overdue for a zinger or two: school cliques, unrepentant parents, etc. Unfortunately, director Michael Lehmann's point of view is swivel-mounted: He doesn't have the courage of his cynicism.

**K-9** (PG-13). A routine cops-and-robbers plot gets a fresh spin when James Belushi, playing a headstrong San Diego narcotics detective gets smart, unpredictable German shepherd Jerry Lee for his new partner.

**LEVIATHAN** (R). It's "The Alien" set beneath the sea instead of outer space — and not nearly as sophisti-

ated. But it's occasionally scary, looks good and moves well under George Cosmatos' vigorous direction. Peter Weller, Richard Crenna.

**LOVERBOY** (PG-13). Patrick Dempsey plays a disingenuous college boy who, instead of working for \$4.90 an hour delivering pizzas on his summer vacation, makes \$200 an afternoon delivering warmth, understanding, tenderness and wildly unsafe sex to every unhappily married woman in greater Los Angeles. A good many talents cranked and burned on this project, most notably Joan Micklin Silver, the credited director.

**MAJOR LEAGUE** (R). David Ward's amiable, amusing baseball comedy, which turns upon the fact that the Cleveland Indians haven't won a pennant since 1954 — and which affords enjoyable, ingenuitously performed from Tom Berenger, Charlie Sheen, Corbin Bernsen, James Gammon and numerous others. A modest winner about a bunch of supposed losers.

**PET SEMATARY** (R). Director Mary Lambert and Stephen King, in adapting his own novel, have created a piece of Americana at its most Gothic: a depiction of a normal family made vulnerable by the eternal yearning to cheat death. A numbing, chilling vision, and not to everyone's

**SAY ANYTHING** (PG-13). Trust Cameron Crowe, writer of "Fast Times at Ridgemont High," to dig among the slag heaps of an almost

mined-out genre — the teen-age movie — and come up with one of the nicest of the species, a film of warmth, insight, humor and surprising originality. Crowe's first direction is not perfect, but when it is good, which is every moment John Cusack is on screen, it is a living joy.

**SEE YOU IN THE MORNING** (PG-13). Writer-director Alan Pakula has given interviewees explaining how close this material is to him, to his heart and to his own knowledge.

# Fox broadcasting plans movie nights starting in September

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Fox Broadcasting Co. is launching a one-a-month movie night in preparation for regular prime-time programming on Monday nights to begin in September.

The movies begin Monday with David Cronenberg's box-office hit, "The Fly."

"We really see the movies and the new night of programming as two separate things," said Peter Chernin, new president of the Fox Entertainment Group. "Soon after we begin Monday-night programming, we hope to start a movie night, probably on Tuesday."

Other upcoming movies in the Fox lineup include "Big Trouble in Little China," scheduled to air Monday, June 5; "Jumpin' Jack Flash," July 10; and "Mannequin," Aug. 28.

The Tuesday movies will begin Oct. 3 with "Black Widow," followed by "Predator" and "Revenge of the Nerds, Part II."

Meanwhile, Fox is looking at 19 pilots-to-fill two hours of prime-time programming on Monday, beginning Sept. 11. Among them are what would be the first television project from film director Francis Ford Coppola, based on his movie version, S.E. Hinton's teen-appeal book, "The Outsiders."

"Our company is solid and the outlook is bullish," said Chernin. "We're going to put on Monday night; then we're going to get on with the business of programming every night of the week."

"I think it's going to be easier going forward now than in the past. The stations are stronger. When we started Sunday night, we had no place to promote it. Two years ago the stations may have had some trepidation, but they've had such success they're ready to tell us to start programming more nights. Everyone's ratings are up."

Fox Broadcasting lost \$50 million last year. But Chernin said the fledgling network will come close to breaking even this fiscal year.

"There's clearly a good deal of pride and pleasure in how far we've come in the last year," he said.

Two Fox Sunday shows, "Married ... With Children" and "America's Most Wanted" often finish ahead of a third of the big networks' shows in the Nielsen ratings. Plans are now being made to improve the ratings for Fox's other shows. "Duet," "It's Garry Shandling's Show" and "The Tracey Ullman Show" have received critical praise but scant viewership.

On Saturday, the addition of the reality-based crime show "Cops" has raised the night's ratings significantly. "It's done for Saturday night what 'America's Most Wanted' did for Sunday night," said Chernin.

Fox ratings may be considerably lower than the networks', but so are its expectations. Fox would consider a show with an 8.0 rating a major success. A network show has to do about a 14.0 to be considered a keeper.

Each rating point equals 904,000 TV households.

"I think the shows that work best for us are those that are attention-getters," said Chernin. "There are numerous ways to get attention. Quality, being innovative, taking chances and using special talents. We go after the younger audience and that goes hand-in-hand because younger viewers are looking for new and innovative shows."

Its take-a-chance attitude has resulted in publicity, for certain. The raunchy comedy "Married ... With Children" drew fire from a Michigan woman, who complained to sponsors who said they would review its content more carefully in the future. But Fox has no plans to alter the show, which has sold out its advertising slots for the season.

Other comedies under consideration for Monday include "Let's Get Mom," a domestic comedy starring Carol Kane; a live, half-hour comedy, "Bill Gets a Life," with comedian Bill Maher as a radio talk-show host; "Babes," a female buddy show about three rather large New York sisters; "Hollywood Dog," a comedy combining live action and animation; and "Urban Renewal," in the tradition of "Laugh-In" and "Saturday Night Live," from Keenan Ivory Wayans.

Besides "The Outsiders," dramas being considered include the movie spinoff, "Alien Nation," about an alien culture coexisting with humans and "Wurlitzer," about a young man who discovers an old jukebox that acts as a time machine.

# Art museums question visitors

LOS ANGELES — A dozen people about to make their first trip to the J. Paul Getty Museum were asked what they thought was housed inside the grand, reconstructed Roman villa perched atop a bluff overlooking the Pacific Ocean.

"It seems (as if you'd find) something stuffy, stand-offish kind of art," one guessed.

"Stuffy and old art," another opined.

"A more complicated type of art," a third ventured.

At least they knew they were headed for an artistic experience. Another first-timer had an entirely different perception of the institution named for the famous oil tycoon who founded it.

Driving past a sign on Pacific Coast Highway that says only "The J. Paul Getty Museum," "I thought, they're gonna show you how they refine oil or something?" he said.

"That was a joke," said Getty Director John Walsh, who heard the comment in a recent focus group, part of the museum's effort to learn more about the public.

The Getty is one of 11 major art museums nationwide conducting the groups in a project sponsored by the Getty Center for Education in the Arts, an operating program of the J. Paul Getty Trust.

The project's main goal is to get more museum professionals — not just educators — thinking about their audience. For instance, curators writing labels that identify artworks should remember that few visitors have the advanced art education that they do.

For each focus group, directors, other administrators, curators, public affairs officials and trustees sit concealed behind a "one-way mirror" through which they can watch visitors being asked a variety of questions about the museum.

"It's a way to get everyone to collaborate more closely on the mission of interpreting artworks for the public," said Leilani Lattin Duke, director of the Getty Center.

The project was launched in December 1987, and all but two of the 11 participating museums have held their focus groups. In November, officials from all 11 will meet to share their experiences, which will be published.

"We're finding that where there was a lack of communication or an adversarial relationship among museum professionals, there is now a great deal of communication," said Alan Newman, president of Alan Newman Research, a 12-year-old Virginia-based market research company conducting the focus groups. "I think this will have a profound impact on lots of areas where the responsibilities have never really been shared."

"Our staff fell in love with the people on the other side of the mirror. The focus groups made their needs and concerns so much more real," said Danielle Rice, education curator at the Philadelphia Museum of Art. "When you do (written) audience research surveys, you get a whole bunch of numbers which are so much harder to relate to than information coming from real live human beings."

# Dramatic version of 'Roe v. Wade' proves fortuitous tie-in with real life

"You can't easily dramatize a Supreme Court case," says Tony Masucci, NBC's senior vice president for movies and miniseries. "And if you do, you can't just make it a piece of fluff." When it comes to this week's "Roe vs. Wade" (airing Monday, May 15, on NBC), Masucci's point becomes an understatement. In supervising the making-of-the-two-hour re-enactment of the case that led to the 1973 Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion, Masucci and the network were very much aware that they were dealing with what he admits is "the most controversial issue of our times."

So controversial was the making of this movie that the shooting locations (mostly in and around Los Angeles) were kept secret, and the project itself was filmed under other ambiguous names ("An American Story" and "Common Knowledge"). "In television, you shoot with a tight schedule and on a tight budget; we couldn't afford any kind of disruption," says Masucci. The script itself went through 20 rewrites, and Masucci says that it has taken since October 1985 to bring the entire project to the screen.

Masucci has supervised other TV movies based on social issues, most notably "Unnatural Causes" (concerning the effects of Agent Orange

on Vietnam veterans) and "An Early Frost" (one of the first TV movies to deal with AIDS). He feels when such issues are involved, extra care must be given to the production. "But it also offers other kinds of opportunities," he adds. "Roe vs. Wade," for example, attracted the attention of two actresses who don't usually do TV: Oscar nominee ("Broadcast News") Holly Hunter, who plays Ellen Russell (the name used in the movie is a substitute for the real-life Norma McCorvey), a poor unmarried Texas carnival barker whose unwanted pregnancy spurred the Roe vs. Wade case; and Amy Madigan ("Field of Dreams," "Twice in a Lifetime"), who plays Russell's fresh-out-of-law school attorney, Sarah Weddington.

"Both actresses did this project because they care about the issue very deeply," says Masucci. "They give fabulous performances."

When he spoke to him, Masucci didn't seem overly intimidated by anti-abortion groups, who may protest about the movie before it's even shown. "Reasonable people, regardless of their persuasion, will say, 'Let's take a look at it' before they either praise or condemn it," he says.

"People who are unreasonable are the ones who will make a rush to judgement."

"Years ago," he recalls, "we did (Franco Zeffirelli's) 'Jesus of Nazareth,' which was said to be an attempt to humanize Christ, and that alone was inflammatory to some people. But I think that movie turned out to be beautiful. I think the same thing happened with Martin Scorsese's film, 'Last Temptation of Christ.' It was judged before it was even released."

Masucci admits that the timing of "Roe vs. Wade" "is fortuitous" now that the historic decision is up for review by the Supreme Court. (A decision on a current test case, presented two weeks ago, is due sometime this summer.) "No matter what happens, abortion is an issue people will always be polarized about," he says. "It affects about half the entire population, as I see it."

ON THE COVER Holly Hunter plays the woman whose case led to the 1973 Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion. "Roe v. Wade" airs Monday, May 15, on NBC.

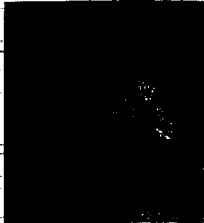
**Q:** Whatever became of actress Ann Turkel's line of super-sexy "tan-through" swimsuits? They look great, but were they too daring? — G.B.

# 'War and Remembrance' proves fitting for TV's 50th anniversary

**HOLLYWOOD** — How fitting that the final chapters of ABC's remarkable "War and Remembrance" should air almost exactly at the half-century mark in United States television.

This rich, definitive American epic is one of the great achievements in television history, a voluminous, awesomely compelling work of stature that captures the heart and spirit of Herman Wouk's powerful novel about a family's tumultuous odyssey through World War II.

A sequel to Wouk's "The Winds of War," which spanned 18 hours on ABC in 1983, the vastly superior "War and Remembrance" opened with 18 hours of its own last November, leading to the present 11-hour finale.

Airing Sunday night and then on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday nights and May 14, it is well worth the huge investment of time.

Better that ABC be known for Wouk II than for "Crimes of Passion 2" and "Scandals II," the tabloid sex-and-crime specials that it recently canceled, the network said, because of fears of its image being damaged and because advertiser resistance to the shows.

Although other major characters still have an ongoing presence, the concluding "War and Remembrance" bloc is essentially the Nazi concentration camp story of Jewish Natalie Henry (Jane Seymour) and her elderly uncle, Aaron Vastrow (John Gielgud), who were interned along with Natalie's toddler son, Louis, after being trapped in German-controlled Europe when the United States entered the war.

As "War and Remembrance" resumes, Natalie's husband, Byron (Hart Bochner), is still a submarine officer at sea, worried about Natalie and Louis and troubled by the atrophied marriage of his parents, Pug (Robert Mitchum) and Rhoda (Polly Bergen) Henry. Now a rear admiral, meanwhile, Pug faces a crossroads in his romance with Englishwoman Pamela Tudsbury (Victoria Tennant).

And Natalie, Louis and Aaron are

in Theresienstadt, the German concentration camp in Czechoslovakia euphemistically dubbed the "paradise ghetto" only because it offered somewhat more humane conditions and was used by the Nazis as a showpiece to disguise their evil.

Like its November predecessor, the new "War and Remembrance" has some softness in its underbelly. Many of the historical figures — from President Franklin D. Roosevelt to Manhattan Project chief Robert Oppenheimer to Gen. Dwight Eisenhower's driver and intimate friend, Kay Summeraby — are caricatures. Fortunately they appear only briefly as human punctuation marks.

What's more, although the overall score is haunting, music used to identify specific subgroups and sub-themes is again mundane and predictable. Members of the German general staff, for example, can hardly make a move without accompanying drums.

And on a more substantive level, executive producer-director — Dan Curtis dwells far too long Monday and Tuesday on a highly embellished version of the failed assassination of Hitler by Count Claus Schenk von Stauffenberg. It serves only to slow the story.

Otherwise, "War and Remembrance" is a tour de force for Curtis, who also collaborated with Wouk and Earl W. Wallace on the script. His characters change, evolve and shed old skins in response to the war that so drastically alters their lives.

None grows more than Natalie, the terrified but fiercely strong mother, or Aaron, the once naive scholar who is reborn as a Jew in an atmosphere of death. It is here, repressed by his Nazi captors, that Aaron gains strength and rediscovers himself, his journal becoming the moral voice of "War and Remembrance" until he reaches Auschwitz, where the Jew's journey finally ends.

The Holocaust is unimaginable to those who have not experienced it, and television's small screen and diverting living room environment make for an unlikely medium of record.

Yet Curtis conveys at least a

sense of the terror in a craftily directed scene showing the sadistic all-night process of selecting exhausted Theresienstadt Jews to be shipped by rail to death camps on the east.

How profoundly symbolic are Curtis' pictures of trains in "War and Remembrance." And how hauntingly are the sounds of boxcars being closed, signifying closure on life, and hope.

Equally affecting is the long, tortuous train journey to Auschwitz that comes later, a slow, freezing, withering, stinking, vomitous, claustrophobic ordeal that Curtis is careful not to hurry, squeezing us amid mostly doomed passengers during what seems like an infinite dark tunnel.

The death camp sequences that follow are almost too painful to watch, and too significant not to watch.

"War and Remembrance" far surpasses "The Winds of War," in part because of crucial cast changes.

Continuing in a role first played by Ali McGraw, Seymour makes Natalie Henry the performance of her career. The flashing vibrancy of her face now drawn and haggard, with only the eyes hinting at the inner resolve.

Gielgud is a marvel in a part originated by the late John Houseman. He is the essence of fine acting, as the once-foolish Aaron, now the epitome of reason and clarity and a courageous visionary in the face of extreme adversity.

Almost as important as Seymour and Gielgud was the addition of Bochner as Byron, in place of James Michael Vincent, and Steven Berkoff makes a fine contribution in the pivotal role of Hitler.

As for "The Winds of War" returns, Bergen again shines as the pathetic and unhappy Rhoda. And Tennant does nicely as Pamela, even though her hot passion for Mitchum's wordless, bloodless, lifeless, calcified Pug is as illogical and unbelievable as ever. When the two are on the screen together which happily is not too often

"War and Remembrance" drops anchor and goes dead in the water.

## Bill Moyers begins looking back to his documentaries

NEW YORK — Beginning on PBS Monday night, Bill Moyers will spend 13 weeks looking back at some of his previous documentaries for CBS and PBS. But fans need not worry: He has not retired to a rocking chair to ponder things that once were. Moyers will return in the fall with two new series and a special for PBS.

The retrospective, "Moyers: A Second Look," consists of 3 of his "CBS Reports" and 10 of the various shows he has done for PBS, spanning 18 years of his work. He will update each with what's happened since then commentary.

First up is Marshall, Texas; Marshall, Texas, his 1984 look at the eastern Texas town in which he grew up and how time and circumstance had changed it. The last, airing July 31, is "The Vanishing Family: Crisis in Black America," one of the last CBS documentaries he did before ending his second tour with CBS News in November 1986 to begin his third in public television.

The series "sort of fills the gap between our most recent broadcasts and the new material coming in the fall," Moyers said.

Moyers, whose production offices are at public-TV station WNET here, said the idea for the spring-summer retrospective came from the station's president, William Baker.

Baker, he said, "noted that a lot of people have grown up in the last

10 years who were in high school, and younger" when the programs first aired. And, buoyed by the success of two recent Moyers series, "Joseph Campbell and the Power of Myth" and "World of Ideas," Baker thought it would be good to give the thirtysomething crowd a chance to see the works of yesteryear.

For many, Moyers reckons, "it'll be new to them, and (it will) give older viewers a chance to see the shows again. A good documentary is more than just a moment, anyway. It's a slice of time that, like a good photograph, you can look at later and see things in it you didn't see the first time."

Moyers' two upcoming series are the five-part "The Power of the Word," slated for September, and "The Public Mind," a four-part November entry.

The first series, he said, "is about contemporary American poets, the people who are really the carriers of language, the couriers of spirit today."

Moyers describes "The Public Mind" as a look at what Americans know about their problems and those of the nation, and how they deal with them.

It has an unlikely origin. "It came about because, at the end of the (presidential) campaign last fall, the General Accounting Office came out with a 22-volume study of the serious issues facing American life," he explained. "And none of them had been addressed in that campaign."

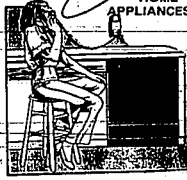

## NBC ties 26-year-old Nielsen mark

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC has tied a 26-year-old CBS record by staying on top of the A.C. Nielsen Co. television ratings for 46 weeks in a row.

NBC won the week ending May 7 with an average, prime-time rating of 13.7. CBS was second with 12.4. ABC was third with an 11.7.

The last time NBC lost a week was to CBS last June during the National Basketball Association championship series. CBS tied NBC one week in February with "Lonesome Dove," but NBC doesn't expect to lose another until CBS has the NBA finals again next month.

"If we hurdle that, and I'm not saying we will, I can't see anything (to stop NBC) until next season," said Gerald Jaffe, NBC vice president for research projects.

The CBS record was set back in the 1962-63 season.

ABC's blockbuster miniseries "War and Remembrance" made a ripple in the ratings. The final 1 1/2 hours of the 39 1/2-hour sequel to "The Winds of War" began Sunday with an unspectacular 13.4 rating and 21 share. The second of the five final installments ran Monday night and rose slightly to a 22 share, according to preliminary ratings from the biggest TV markets.

NBC's airing of the theatrical release "Witness." Despite its availability on cable and videocassette, the movie ranked 10th in the ratings.

Each rating point equals 904,000 households with television. The share is a percentage of sets in use.

ABC also wasn't helped by the last-minute replacement of "Scandals II," a "reality-based" special, with the unsold pilot "Three of a Kind" Saturday night. "Scandals II," like "Crimes of Passion II" a week earlier, was pulled because of lack of advertiser support.

The conclusion of CBS' two-part "Guts & Glory: The Rise and Fall of Oliver North" didn't stir viewers. It ranked 58th with a 9.8 rating and a 15 share.

NBC got a seventh-place finish from its Saturday-night hit "Hunter," which had its highest rat-

ing since last July.

The top 10 shows of the week were: "Roseanne" ABC, "The Cosby Show" NBC, "Cheers" NBC, "A Different World" NBC, "60 Minutes" CBS, "Golden Girls" NBC, "Hunter" NBC, "The Wonder Years" ABC, "Empty Nest" NBC, and "Witness" NBC.

The 10 lowest-rated network shows were: "Tour of Duty," "Hard Time on Planet Earth," "Disney's Totally Minnie," "Dream Street," "A Man Called Hawk," "American Kids: Teaching Them—How to Think," "Jim Honson," "Over the Edge," "SST: Stage, Screen and Television" and "Three of a Kind."

"ABC World News Tonight" retook the lead in the news race with a 10.0 rating and 21 share. The "CBS Evening News" had a 9.8 and 20. "NBC Nightly News" had a 9.2 and 20 share.

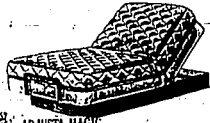

## Art imitates life Monday — Ellerbee plays newswoman

The concept of Monday morning quarterbacking is well-established in sports, so why not in the business of media-watching? The last week or so has brought a handful of egregious moments worth questioning.

But first, something clever: "Murphy Brown" Monday night on CBS is scheduled to feature a guest appearance by one-time network newswoman Linda Ellerbee. In a flashback plot, she plays a rival for air time with fictional newswoman Candice Bergen. Given this show's fairly caustic commentary about TV, and Ellerbee's reputation for telling it like it is, the show ought to crackle.

Now, to our own criticisms in the real world of TV:

Just give us the names, Dan. CBS anchor Dan Rather worked overtime Thursday coming up with modifiers for some of the principals in the Oliver North verdict story. At one point he termed the former Marine's lawyer "Brendan 'I Am Not a Potted Plant' Sullivan" (referring to the attorney's plant during the Iran-Contra hearings), and later

talked of North as "the criminally convicted Oliver North."

Also on CBS earlier in the week, "CBS This Morning" anchor Kathleen Sullivan had a bad day with the chairman of the Exxon Corporation and with Orioles' manager Frank Robinson. The Exxon officer actually had to prompt her to remember the word "dispersant," which the company claims it was not allowed to deploy in timely fashion to control the Alaska oil spill.

Then with Robinson, Sullivan asked him how the trade of "Eddie Murphy" would hurt the team. She meant former Bird's first baseman Eddie Murray, of-course. —But—at least she recognized the error immediately, becoming momentarily tongue-tied before saying something like, "I always mix them up."

Did you catch Gerardo Rivera's strutting coverage early last week on the grisly cult-murder-cannibalism case out of Brownsville, Texas? Referring to his much-reviled NBC special on Satanism last fall, Rivera gloated that people had not believed such things were occurring among young people, implying that he has now been vindicated.
