## Bush lists terms for normal ties with China

WASHINGTON — President Bush said Thursday night the United States cannot return to "totally normal relations" with China unless that government ends violence against its own people and recognizes the validity of pro-democracy forces.

Bush also readily agreed that newly elected Democratic House Speaker Thomas S. Foley had been dealt "a terrible ill service" by the publication of a Republican Party circular.

Many of the questions dealt with China, and while Bush defended the limited nature of the sanctions he announced on Monday — principally banning the sale of weapons — he said:  
"We're not going to remake the world; but we ought to stand for something." In China — South Africa and elsewhere in the world where democracy is under siege.  
Bush said he hopes to "preserve the relationship" that the United States has built with China. But he added that the United

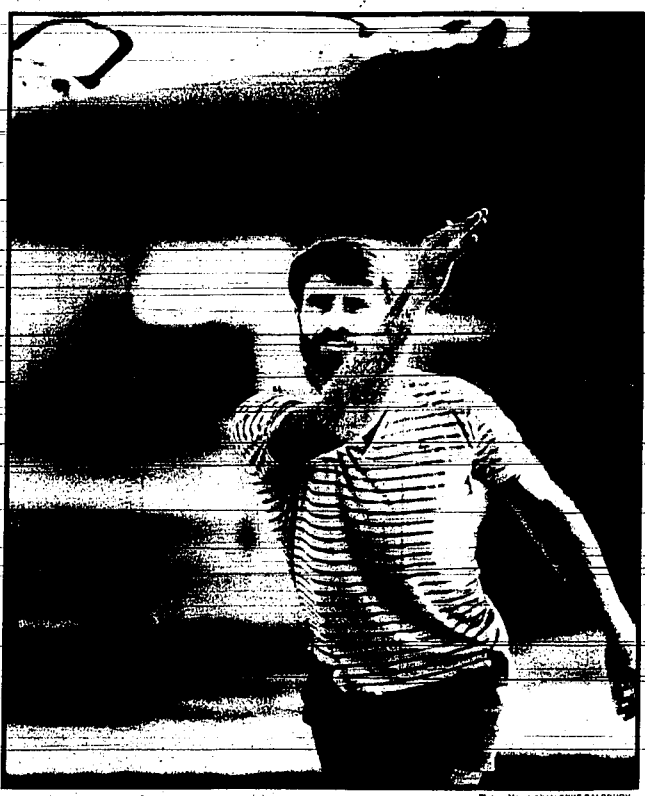
States denounces the violence of last weekend, when Chinese troops swept through Beijing, routing pro-democracy demonstrators and killing hundreds and perhaps thousands of people.  
Bush placed his own distinct stamp on his first evening news conference. He opted for a less-regal, curtain-raiser than Ronald Reagan favored, entering the East Room from an adjacent room rather than striding down a long red carpet toward waiting reporters.  
On other matters, Bush said he intends to tell Polish leaders later this summer "we want to work with

you," provided economic and pro-democracy reforms continue. "When a country moves as Poland did, down democracy's path, the United States should respond as best it could," said Bush, who will visit Warsaw and Odamsk next month.  
"Renewed his call for the ouster of Panama's leader, Manuel Noriega, and a fair election to select a successor. "They would have instant improved relations with the U.S.," he said. "I'm not going to give up on this."

## Beijing may face new crackdowns

BEIJING — Premier Li Peng, whose martial law order for troops to clear Tiananmen Square of student protesters resulted in hundreds of deaths, is expected to be publicly humiliated for the first time since the weekend massacre.  
He briskly praised soldiers for a job well done.  
Li's televised appearance added weight to word that hardline, conservative Communist party leaders had emerged victorious in a power struggle with reformists who sympathized with student demands to open China's political system. Li's chief rival, disgraced Communist party chief Zhuo Ziyang, has been neither heard nor spoken of for three weeks.  
"You have worked hard, comrades," Li told a group of soldiers at an indoor meeting. Raising his arm and voice at once, he encouraged the troops to continue working hard to protect the capital's safety and order.  
Li, wearing a Mao jacket rather than the coat and tie often favored by the reformists, appeared with Vice President Wang Zhen, a conservative former army general best known for violently subduing far

western Xinjiang province in 1949, at the beginning of Communist rule in China.  
A new set of martial law regulations appeared to foreshadow renewed crackdowns on dissidents.  
The building of L'Orangers was banned and government radio broadcast telephone hotline numbers to which citizens were told they should report activities of "counter-revolutionaries."  
One government edict referred to student activists and leaders of embryonic independent trade unions as "important members of the counter-revolutionary turmoil."  
The terminology marked the latest step in a steady demonization of the pro-democracy movement. For a while, the government had referred to the students as "patriotic" and blamed demonstrations on manipulative officials high up in the Communist Party.  
Many student leaders are believed to be in hiding.  
At least five military trucks carrying soldiers passed near Beijing University Thursday night and paramilitary police set up cordons on roads leading to the area.  
Foreigners continued to leave the city on special flights out of Beijing.

## Health risk listing cites Idaho plant

WASHINGTON — A House panel chairman Thursday distributed federal data identifying 205 industrial plants — including one from Idaho — as increasing cancer risks through release of airborne toxic chemicals.  
The Environmental Protection Agency quickly disputed his interpretations.  
An EPA spokesman said the information was old and incomplete, and complained it was "highly irresponsible" to use it as "reflective of risks in the real world."  
However, Rep. Henry A. Waxman, chairman of the House Energy and Commerce environment subcommittee, said that even potentially inaccurate figures should be released because they indicate the enormity of the problem and represent a "stunning demonstration of the urgency of the public health threat."  
Waxman, D-Calif., said at a news conference that toxic chemicals present a cancer risk at the plant at least a thousand-fold greater than levels accepted by experts.  
The plants on the list, compiled by the EPA, pose at least a 1-in-1,000 cancer risk to people getting maximum exposure for a lifetime, while the EPA deems a risk of more than 1-in-a-million as unacceptable.  
The only Idaho plant on the list was the Potlatch Corp. facility at Lewiston. It was on the list of those rated as having a risk of more than 1 in 100 but less than 1 in 10.  
The EPA said the worst plant on the list was the Texaco butadiene plant in Port Neches, Texas, with at least a 1-in-10 risk of cancer.  
Texaco labeled the estimate "totally unsupported by any technical and scientific facts or by

## Discount food firm plans Twin Falls store

TWIN FALLS — Area bargain hunters will have new territory to prow through as a new discount food store opens in Twin Falls late this winter.  
Canned Foods Group Outlet, a chain with stores in California, Washington, Oregon and Idaho, will open its fourth Idaho store next to the K-Mart on Addison Avenue East, said Dale Cable, manager of Canned Foods Group's Burley store.  
The outlet store sells non-perishable canned goods, frozen foods, some housewares and health and beauty aids, Cable said. The outlets primarily stock discontinued and overstocked items from major manufacturers at prices discounted 25 to 50 percent, he added.  
"We are the largest closeout market in the country," Cable said. "We sell a little bit of everything."

The new store should open by the first of next year and will employ 15 to 20 people, he said.  
The San Francisco-based chain plans to build a 16,000 to 20,000-square-foot store, about half the size of the nearby 35,000-square-foot Albertson's Food Center.  
Albertson's Manager Joseph Riecke said he knew the Canned Foods Group has been looking at the Twin Falls market for years.  
Cable said the Canned Foods Group Outlet opened its Burley store with 12 employees in May 1988. He said the chain operates in a co-ownership agreement whereby the parent company pays for the building and recruits an operator who then purchases the equipment and merchandise from the chain.  
Under this system, management decisions are made locally, Cable said. The name of the new Twin Falls operator has not yet been announced.

## U.S. proposes rules for WWII internee payments

WASHINGTON — The Justice Department proposed regulations Thursday to distribute \$1.25 billion in reparations to about 60,000 Japanese-Americans who survived internment during World War II.  
About 120,000 American citizens and permanent resident aliens of Japanese ancestry were affected by the evacuations from the West Coast. The department said that only about 60,000 people are eligible for the \$200,000 payments.  
The oldest survivors must be paid first. The Civil Liberties Act of 1988, authorizing the

payments, became law last August. Congress has not yet appropriated funds.  
Under the law, payments go to those confined, held-in-custody, relocated or "otherwise deprived of liberty or property" from Dec. 7, 1941, to June 30, 1946, because of U.S. actions based on their Japanese ancestry.  
To be eligible, said Robert Bratt of the department's Office of Redress Administration, "you had to be living" when then-President Franklin Roosevelt signed the law, Aug. 10, 1988.  
"But people are dying at a rate of about 200 people per month. If your parent died after Aug.

10, 1988, then you're eligible as a survivor," said Bratt.  
The first recipient would be the surviving spouse, followed by children and parents, if there are any, he said.  
The department is responsible for dividing the \$300 million equally among several children, he said.  
Each member of a family evacuated and interned will be compensated, so a family of four still surviving would receive \$80,000, Bratt said.  
Compensation also will go to Japanese-American soldiers who lost property or were unable to visit with their interned families, according to the proposed regulations.

## Jury convicts Pratt brothers of slaying Forest Service officer

COEUR D'ALENE — Two brothers may face the death penalty after their conviction Thursday on first-degree murder charges in the January shotgun slaying of U.S. Forest Service law enforcement officer Brent "Jake" Jacobson.  
James and Joseph Pratt stated straight ahead and showed no emotion as the Kootenai County jury's verdicts were read.

Jurors also convicted 29-year-old James of Indian Hills, Colo., and his 27-year-old brother Joseph, of Sandpoint, of 16 other felony counts, including kidnapping, robbery, attempted first-degree murder and aggravated assault stemming from the break-in at a Sandpoint-area residence Jan. 19, 1988.  
"We're absolutely elated," said Bonner County Prosecutor Phillip Robinson after the verdicts were announced. "It was obviously

difficult thing for the jury to reach its decision."  
Jurors deliberated for a day and a half. Jacobson, 41, died Jan. 12 after he and Bonner County Deputy Sheriff Steve Barbieri cornered the Pratts near Dover, southwest of Sandpoint, after a 20-hour manhunt.  
Jacobson, a former Twin Falls resident, spent his youth exploring the Rock Creek and Snake River canyons and hunting. He

moved to Twin Falls from Provo, Utah, in 1962.  
A 1965 Twin Falls High School graduate, Jacobson left the area for a stint with the U.S. Navy after one year at the College of Southern Idaho.  
He attended classes at Idaho State University and Utah State University before accepting a full-time job with the Forest Service in 1974.  
Brother-in-law Bob Blake called Jacobson

an "incredible hunter and fisherman."  
First District Judge Watt Prutner set a July 24 hearing to rule on possible mitigating circumstances to the first-degree murder counts, which can carry the death penalty. A sentencing date will be set after the mitigation hearing, Prutner said.  
The judge asked the death sentence for the murder counts, or could sentence the brothers to life in prison without possibility

# SIS study commission bothers Stallings

POCATELLO (AP) — Congressman Richard Stallings says the fate of the Special Isotope Separation project planned for eastern Idaho rests with a congressionally commissioned study of its need, and he is concerned over reports that study will be negative.

Stallings speculated that staff members of the House Armed Services Committee were the source of what he called rumors that the report will cast doubt on the need for the laser-driven plutonium refinery planned for the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

A special Armed Services subcommittee headed by Rep. John Spratt, D-S.C., commissioned U.S. Military Academy physicist Tom Johnson to review the \$1.2 billion addition to the nation's nuclear weapons production system. Johnson's report is expected to be submitted to the panel later this month.

"At this point I don't know," Stallings said. "I have not seen the report. I've talked with Spratt and he has not seen it. Apparently some staffers at Armed Services got similar indications, and that's where the rumors are coming from. It does have us concerned."

Stallings said he would be surprised if the need for the project is questioned since he feels the Department of Energy has justified it. But if the Johnson report is negative, it could easily kill the SIS, he said.

The congressman conceded that while he has received classified briefings on U.S. plutonium stocks, their technical nature makes it difficult for a layman to know whether the SIS is needed.

"I think that's one reason why

Spratt brought in Col. Johnson, because he is a physicist and he can go into the details," Stallings said. "He understands it better than Spratt or any of the committee members or the committee staffers."

The Spratt panel will use the report in making its recommendation to a procurement subcommittee on whether the project should be financed. Since its members are highly respected in the House, Stallings said, "if they come out opposed to it, if the panel decides there is not the need or they can't afford the billion dollars, then I'd say it's nearly dead."

The Johnson report will be classified, but Spratt aide Bob DeGrasse said the special congressional panel hoped to eventually make public an unclassified version although that is "long beyond the time when it's relevant."

# Co-workers build trail to honor Jacobson

SAGLE (AP) — While a jury deliberated the fate of two men accused of killing Forest Service officer Brent "Jake" Jacobson, the other officers of the agency worked to build a lakeside trail that will be dedicated in his honor.

"Ironically, we started the same day the trial started," said Mary Ann Hamilton, the trail crew leader who worked with Jacobson in the federal

agency's Sandpoint office. "It's a real pleasure for us to be out here."

A group of summer employees that Jacobson directed in his capacity as assistant fire management officer has been laboring for 2½ weeks on the 1.6-mile trail. It will link Green Bay Campground with Mineral Point Interpretive Trail on the west side of Lake Pend Oreille.

# Williams calls for deprecation cease-fire

BOISE (AP) — State Auditor J.D. Williams has called for a cease-fire in the war of words over landowners' compensation claims for damage done by marauding big game last winter.

In a statement issued Thursday, Williams said criticism of Fish and Game Department of Fish and Game recommendation on how the claims should be handled was unfair and premature.

The decision on payment of deprecation claims rests with the state Board of Examiners, composed of Williams, Gov. Cecil Andrus and Attorney General Jeth Jones. And the auditor said a review was continuing.

Fish and Game's recommendations on claims for damage done during the last six

months of 1988 came "after a great deal of work by the department in a short time..." Williams said.

"Fish & Game's decision is not fixed and it doesn't do anyone any good to disagree with the law which allows payment from Fish & Game funds for damage caused by big game," he said. "What will do some good is to let the system work."

The 1989 Legislature earmarked \$500,000 from state hunting and fishing license and tag fees to compensate landowners for big game damage during the last half of 1988 and the first half of 1989.

More than \$1.1 million in claims were submitted by 115 Idaho farmers and ranchers for deprecation in 1988, and another 81 claims for almost \$580,000 were filed for damage during 1989.

After a preliminary investigation of most of the 1988 claims, Fish and Game last week recommended to the Board of Examiners that less than 11 percent be paid. The department also urged further investigation into more than 30 claims where there were indications that at least some of the losses were covered by federal drought relief payments.

Williams said he would ask experts from the University of Idaho Agricultural Extension Service and the federal and state departments of Agriculture to submit their independent assessments of the claims.

But some claimants quickly condemned the Fish and Game report, saying they would stand by their claims and press for full compensation.

# Woman dies rafting on swollen Selway

GRANGEVILLE (AP) — A whitewater rafting trip ended tragically when a Utah woman was killed after being tossed into raging rapids on the Selway River in a remote part of the Nez Perce National Forest, authorities said.

Karen Branson, 41, of Salt Lake City was among 14 Utah residents in three rafts and two or three kayakers on a river trip that began Sunday in Hamilton, Mont., said Idaho County Sheriff Randy Baldwin.

On Wednesday, the group encountered extremely rough rapids about three or four miles west of the Moose Creek Ranger Station, deep inside the Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness in east-central Idaho, Baldwin said.

A day earlier, two men were arrested in Montana when they tried to retrieve one of the slain men's pickup truck, which contained a mobile drug production lab, authorities said.

## China's leaders drive country backwards

In a 24-hour period, China's leaders may well have destroyed 10 years of painstaking effort to achieve modernization.

It is hard to imagine how they will be able to govern after the recent massacre. The possibility of China's reverting to regional centers controlled by conflicting factions—the nightmare of a new world order—cannot be ruled out. Nor can all-out civil war.

Internationally, in addition to poisoning the climate for foreign investment, the events of the past few days cast doubt on the prospect of China's bringing Hong Kong into its governing orbit. Recent progress in developing contacts with Taiwan will suffer a major setback.

I am overwhelmed by the apparent innocence of the victims. For 10 years Deng Xiaoping and his colleagues have deplored the human toll of the Cultural Revolution, promising the Chinese that such a thing would not happen again. Believing in that promise, thousands died because of an innocent trust in their government.

Perhaps Americans have been so

fascinated by the positive changes in China that we have failed to notice other signs of Deng's obsession with control and order. From the Democracy Wall Movement of 1978 and 1979 to the 1986-'87 student demonstrations, each popular demand for political reform and free expression has ended the same way—by being squashed.

Remembering Deng's background also helps put his policies of the past decade into perspective, and makes his lethal response to the developments of the past few weeks less of a surprise: No democratic reformer, Deng is instead part of the same old authoritarian, Marxist generation as Mao. It wasn't for his democratic ideas that he was humiliated and excoriated during the Cultural Revolution, but for being part of a pro-Russian, Stalinist clique—perhaps more Stalinist than Americans have wanted to recognize.

In addition to being part of China's particular political experience, last

weekend's events have a universal element. They are only the most recent example of the human tendency to project all wrong, all evil, onto the other, which makes it possible to think of that other as so tainted, or undeveloped as to be less than human, or not like us. The mirror image of such projection is an inability or refusal to acknowledge the presence of negative qualities in oneself.

In a far less sinister way, we are also projecting when, contemplating the bloody horror, we conclude that such a thing could never happen in a free, democratic, modern country. In fact, no country, no leadership, no individual, is immune to this danger. It is universal falling to which we are all prone, though fortunately it does not often reach the kind of ultimate expression we have just seen in Beijing.

For Hitler and the Nazis, the Jews were the enemy other. For the Khmer Rouge leaders in Cambodia, apparently all Cambodians but themselves were obstacles to the new society they thought they were creating.

American history is not free of similar

projections. The massacre of native Americans at Wounded Knee and other places come to mind, as does the Civil War. As John Donne said, no one is an island. The toll that marks another's death falls for each of us as well. A massacre halfway around the world touches us all, partly by reminding us that we share in both the human and the inhuman ways people relate to one another, as individuals or as groups.

## Divided military becomes China power broker

China's military has been thrust into the uncomfortable role of power broker between government and Communist Party factions.

The student demonstrations of the past two months have sharpened splits between reformers and conservatives within the leadership elite, with neither side able to win a decisive victory.

Both reformers and conservatives have powerful arguments for their points of view. Reformers argue that if China is to modernize and become a prosperous, influential member of the international community, continuing changes will be necessary: The prices of more commodities need to be freed from state control, there should be an expansion of the system of labor contracts and businesses that cannot turn a profit should be allowed to go bankrupt. Within limits, workers and artists should be allowed to express their creative instincts, even if that means tolerating responsible criticism of party and government, reformers say.

Conservatives have countered with cogent arguments of their own: Decontrolling prices has resulted in an unacceptably high level of inflation; several years of reformers' efforts to control it have left the inflation rate higher rather than lower. The existence of so-called dual-track pricing—a set of prices determined by the market and the other set determined by the central government—has encouraged hoarding, speculative activities and corruption. All have reached alarming levels.

of government would be to open floodgates that could not be contained.

The onerous scale and careful organization of the student demonstrations that began in April seemed to confirm the conservatives' worst fears. Interspersed with abstract calls for freedom and democracy, were sharp criticisms of specific leaders. Those included calls for the resignations of Deng Xiaoping, the father of the reform movement, and Premier Li Peng, the leading conservative.

With the country teetering on the edge of mass chaos, conservatives, joined by Deng, favored the imposition of martial law. They were opposed by Deng's erstwhile protégé-reformist Party Secretary General Zhao Ziyang, who attempted to negotiate with the students. The conservatives prevailed and declared martial law. This was the military formally entered onto the political balance sheet. There should have been no doubt that the army would react as ordered. Its highest command is the Central Military Commission, was none other than Deng Xiaoping himself.

Due to Deng's involvement in many other affairs of state, the actual administration of the day-to-day affairs of the military had been handled by his handpicked choice, Yang Shangkun. Yang's protégé was head of the general staff of the army, and his younger brother was head of its general political department. And Defense Minister Fan Wei was a protégé of Deng, whose career had suffered the very same ups and downs as Deng's own.

It was therefore a shock when a hundred top military leaders, including the defense minister, signed a petition urging that no force be used against the students. What

would appear to the Western mind as gross misbehavior in acting on military discipline appear so to most Chinese. When there has been consensus within the leadership of the party and government, the military has faithfully executed its orders. When the party and government are deeply divided, as they are now and were during the Cultural Revolution of the 1960s, those divisions are reflected in similar factions in the military. Many military leaders hold high positions in the party and government, and the distinction between civil and military spheres is far less clear-cut than in the United States.

While stopping short of endorsing the demonstrators' demands, the hundred signers tacitly placed themselves on the side of the reformers. Other military commanders tended to agree with the conservatives. Those included a unit, the 27th Army, whose former political commissar is now the chief of the general staff and is considered protégé of Yang.

Loyalist networks are apt to be as important as ideology in determining a Chinese official's stance.

When the 8th Army, taking its lead from its former commander, Defense Minister Qin, proved reluctant to fight the students, the 27th was brought in. Its brutal Bloody Sunday massacre of the students has been followed by skirmishes with troops from the 38th Army. Additional units, now numbering an estimated 360,000, have been brought in from outlying areas. It appears that the two factions have called in as many units loyal to themselves as they could muster.

The capital remains tense and the probability of further violence is high. The allegiances of most of these units are

Premier remains on top for present unknown, so it is difficult to predict who will prevail. Other aspects of the army's role are clearer. The leadership, having invited the military back into the political process, may find it difficult to get it out. The dispute between the two factions in the central leadership has grown to the extent that it has badly weakened the power of the party and government in general, and has raised serious questions about the legitimacy of the institutions through which it functions.

Moreover, instituting bankruptcy procedures would not necessarily mean that businesses would become more productive. In the one city where the practice has been used most extensively, business losses increased. Conservatives also argue that to tolerate criticism of the party and

create trade surpluses—the most basic definition of competitiveness—must be a last resort, and a highly undesirable one. It means our merchandise goods are so cheap that the world will buy them regardless of quality. And it means that American living standards have taken a dive.

Rebuilding a strong manufacturing sector able to pay high wages and still sell in world markets takes time. According to a newly released study done for Eastman Kodak Co., "Meeting World Challenges: U.S. Manufacturing in the 1990s," manufacturing inevitably will become a larger share of the U.S. economy as we are forced to run trade surpluses, since manufactured goods are mostly what we trade.

But it is by no means assured that this "reindustrialization" will lead to better living standards for

American. To the contrary, America could end up the low wage competitor of West Germany and Japan unless we have sharp changes in policy soon.

A first-rate education system and sound technology policy are the foundations upon which we need to rebuild manufacturing. But neither is in place at the moment.

As a manufacturer of high-technology goods, I am alarmed that Kodak will be unable to find adequately educated and trained workers for our plants in the years ahead. Jobs will go begging because the skilled labor will simply not be available.

In Rochester, N.Y., only 2 percent of the jobs that need to be filled can be described as unskilled, yet anywhere from 10 to 15 percent of the work force is below high school equivalency!

As a manufacturer, I can speak

The business administration's willingness to provide federal seed money for the development of high-definition television technology is a welcome first step that at the national level development of commercial technologies is recognized as important to our economic future. ### Mitchell renews calls for overall reform of ethics

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senate Majority Leader George Mitchell said Thursday Congress is "caught in a vise" of competing pressures on ethics reform, but he promised action.

"We do have a problem. We have to act," Mitchell said.

He said that skepticism about public officials is healthy but that "a danger occurs when skepticism becomes cynicism and mistrust."

Mitchell renewed his call for a ban on speaking fees, coupled with a pay raise. But he said members of Congress are reluctant to risk the wrath of their constituents by voting themselves raises to make up for losing the fees.

One possibility, he said, would be to gradually lower limits on speech fees, known as honoraria, while gradually increasing congressional salaries.

Mitchell, D-Maine, spoke to a group of reporters in his Capitol office at a time when congressional ethics issues have been brought to the fore by allegations that brought resignation announcements from House Speaker Jim Wright and Democratic Whip Tony Coelho.

Some of the allegations against Wright concerned rules on honoraria, while Coelho has been criticized for a private investment deal.

### GOP takes tough S&L bailout line

WASHINGTON (AP) — House Republicans threatened on Thursday to turn debate on a \$143 billion bailout of the savings and loan industry into a reshaping of industry wrongdoing by Democrats if President Bush is attacked over his S&L rescue package.

With the S&L bill headed to the House floor next week, GOP Whip Newt Gingrich of Georgia urged Democrats to be "extremely cautious" in trying to blame Bush for the costs of the bailout — the biggest in the nation's history.

Gingrich commented after Rep. MARY KAPTUR, D-Ohio, using a cartoon of Bush prepared by the United Auto Workers union as a prop on the House floor, called his bailout proposal "the biggest tax increase in recent memory."

FSLIC — pronounced feds-lick — is the acronym for the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corp., the agency that insures depositors against losses up to \$100,000 each and that now has an estimated deficit of between \$35 billion and \$35 billion because of risky and often fraudulent lending by S&Ls.

### Drought shifts to Southwest

DENVER (AP) — Severe to extreme drought conditions cover much of the West for the third consecutive year, but the intensity is shifting from the Northwest to the Southwest, state and federal officials said Thursday.

"Things are not desperate, but they're getting desperate awfully fast," said North Dakota Gov. George Sinner, chairman of the Western Governors' Association's Drought and Water Policy board which met in Denver.

Sinner said recent rains have helped some states hit hard by last year's drought, one of the worst this century, but he said many states are just recovering, and crop and cattle losses are expected to be high again this year.

However, a spokesman for the U.S. Department of Agriculture said the deficiencies are being made up in other states, and he expected no food shortages this year.

Sinner criticized his group and other agencies for their failure to adequately cope with last year's drought.

and Republican task forces in the Senate are studying proposals for ethics reform. But he said, "It's difficult to act in a situation in which there is no clear consensus."

"We hope in the near future to be able to go forward with some effort in the areas of banning speech fees, known as honoraria, and raising pay," he said. But he also said "if prevailing public sentiment were the sole determining factor, the pay of members of Congress today would be exactly what it was 200 years ago."

### Court finds Kentucky's schooling unconstitutional

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — The state Supreme Court declared Kentucky's system of public schooling unconstitutional Thursday and ordered the legislature to reinvent it.

By permitting a wide gap between poor and wealthier school districts, the legislature failed to meet its constitutional duty, the court ruled.

"Least there be any doubt, the result of our decision is that Kentucky's entire system of common schools is unconstitutional," Chief Justice Robert Stephens wrote for the court's five-member majority.

Rich and poor alike "must be given the same opportunity and access to an adequate education,"

the court ruled in a case brought four years ago by a coalition of 66 "property poor" districts.

The decision applies to the entire sweep of the system — all its parts and parcels, including laws and regulations for setting, implementing and financing the system, the opinion said.

They included laws creating local school districts and school boards, the state Department of Education, school construction and maintenance, teacher certification — "the whole gamut of the common school system in Kentucky," the opinion said.

Gov. Wallace Wilkinson, a longtime critic of the state's school-management scheme, said the court

had given Kentucky its greatest opportunity of the last century.

"We've been talking about changing the management culture within the system," Wilkinson said in a news conference. "We never imagined that we'd have an opportunity to remake the entire system."

State Schools Superintendent John Brock called it the happiest day of his professional life.

The General Assembly's ranking members — Senate President Pro Tem John "Eck" Rose and House Speaker Don Blandford — said building the kind of education system the court required was sure to be expensive, but they were willing.

# Number of AIDS victims underestimated

WASHINGTON (AP) — A University of Chicago study released Thursday said that federal officials may be significantly underestimating the number of Americans with AIDS and that there are more whites and fewer blacks with the disease than previously believed.

Edward O. Laumann of the National Opinion Research Center at the University of Chicago said that estimates by the federal Centers for Disease Control of the numbers of AIDS cases are distorted because affluent whites can afford to be treated discreetly by physicians who do not report the disease.

The CDC makes its estimate based on cases re-

ported to official agencies. An undercount or a failure to report cases could seriously affect the CDC estimate, said Laumann.

"We are contending that there is an undercount, but we don't know the scale of it," said Laumann, who co-authored a report appearing Friday in the journal Science. "We can estimate the demographic composition, but not the gross numbers themselves. The reason we're being cautious is that this is too small a sample."

To gather data for the study, Laumann and his associates conducted interviews of 1,481 households around the country. The households were selected to reflect a cross section of the population.

The results, said the study, "suggest that the white proportion of AIDS cases is substantially higher than CDC reports and that a substantially greater share of the cases is in the midwestern region."

According to CDC figures from March 7, whites compose about 60 percent of the nation's AIDS cases. The University of Chicago study said the correct number is 72 percent.

The CDC said that 26 percent of all cases are black and 14 percent are Hispanic. The Chicago results estimate these totals as 18 percent for blacks, and 6 percent for Hispanics.

## Baker wants economic ties

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State James A. Baker III said Thursday that the U.S.-Chinese relationship has suffered a "tragic... step backward" and stressed that economic ties should be maintained to foster democratic reforms in China.

Baker, speaking at the National Press Club, reported that the evacuation of U.S. citizens from China appeared to be going well, and that all Americans who had gotten to Beijing's airport had been flown out of the country.

"We're keeping our fingers crossed," Baker said of the evacuation of U.S. dependents of diplomatic personnel, which he ordered a day earlier after diplomatic compounds in the capital were raked by gunfire.

The secretary had also appealed to private U.S. citizens to leave the country as soon as possible.

Baker made a point of saying that the United States has worked hard to improve ties with China since relations were formalized in 1979.

"We've spent many years in improving relations between the U.S. and China, in encouraging the movement towards democracy," Baker said, adding, "We've had a very tragic step backward."

# Tornadoes hammer Louisiana

A tornado smashed nearly a square mile of a small, rural town in Louisiana early Thursday, killing two people.

Tornadoes, rain and high wind from thunderstorms also caused damage in parts of Mississippi, Alabama and Florida.

Tornadoes skipped across several Louisiana parishes early Thursday. One twister struck the small town of Grosse Tete, La., about 6 a.m. Thursday, destroying at least 25 residences and injuring at least 15 people, in addition to the two people killed, authorities said.

No serious injuries were reported 15 miles away in Baton Rouge, where Fire Chief Ron Spillman said at least four twisters touched down 19 times, destroying or damaging almost 70 mobile homes and 25 to 30 houses.

Pieces of mobile homes were strewn in tree tops in Grosse Tete. About 100 people were evacuated and were put up in emergency shelters, Hurdle said. The storm left the town without electricity, natural gas, water and most telephone service.

Over a two-hour period, tornadoes also were reported in the parishes of West Baton Rouge, St. Helena, Livingston and Tangipahoa. The early morning tornadoes in southeastern Louisiana followed a night of violent weather in the western and central part of the state in which several homes were destroyed or damaged late Wednesday, but no serious injuries were reported.

Another tornado hit Ellisville, Miss., during the morning, damaging buildings and cars and uprooting trees, according to the Jones County Civil Defense. Mississippi Power Co. official Dana Hill said most power in Ellisville was restored by early afternoon.

Heavy rain was reported in several areas of Mississippi during the night, with up to 4 inches on coastal sections.

WASHINGTON (AP) — El Salvador's air force improperly sold \$100,000 worth of fuel provided by the United States to air crews resupplying the Nicaraguan Contras in an effort set up by Oliver North, the General Accounting Office told Congress Thursday.

Assistant Comptroller General Frank C. Conahan testified that the transfer of the fuel "violated agreements" between the United States and El Salvador stipulating that title or possession of U.S.-supplied defense items or services cannot be transferred without prior U.S. government consent.

Conahan said pilots under contract to the Contra resupply operation run by former Air Force Maj. Gen. Richard V. Secord bought fuel on at least 63 occasions in 1986 from tanks on the military side of Hlopango Air Base. He said U.S.-supplied fuel was provided on 32 of these occasions.

Conahan said that from April to September 1986 the Salvadoran air force sold 61,107 gallons of the U.S.-provided fuel to the Contra resupply enterprises.

"We found no evidence that the Salvadoran government requested or obtained U.S. consent for the Salvadoran air force to transfer military aid program funded fuel to the Contra supply operation," Conahan said.

Nor, he said, was evidence found that any U.S. personnel knew of the sales.

## World Votes show Solidarity dominance

WARSAW, Poland (AP)—In a humiliating slap at the ruling elite, voters rejected Prime Minister Mieczyslaw F. Rakowski and 22 other communist-backed candidates who ran unopposed for parliament, official results showed Thursday.

The returns confirm Solidarity's astonishing dominance of Sunday's balloting and the crisis that has been created for the communists, who agreed to let the opposition take part in the most open balloting since World War II.

In his first comments since the balloting, Polish leader Gen. Wojciech Jaruzelski was quoted as saying the party would be willing to give up power completely if it loses the next elections in 1993, which he said should be completely free.

This year's election limited how many seats Solidarity could seek. "I would like to see totally free elections because I think a state of political solutions and social relations would make them possible," he was quoted as saying by the British daily The Independent.

Asked if the party would be willing to relinquish power as the result of those elections, he was reported to reply: "It is logical that if you talk about free elections, one assumes any outcome is possible."

Solidarity won almost all the seats in the newly created Senate and virtually all of those it was allotted in the existing Sejm, which is now the lower chamber of the new parliament.

The amazing dominance gives the opposition power to veto Sejm legislation, and its representation in the Sejm can keep that body from mustering the two-thirds necessary to override a veto.

## Air show crash injures Soviet fighter pilot

PARIS (AP)—A Soviet MiG-29 fighter crashed during an aerobatic performance Thursday on the opening day of the Paris Air Show, and the pilot was injured after bailing out of the jet.

The aircraft was making its final pass over Le Bourget airfield north of Paris after a dramatic demonstration flight when a part of the aircraft appeared to break away.

Pieces of the needle-nosed jet burst into flames while the fuselage, in one piece, dropped like a stone in the center of the airfield without injuring any of the thousands of exhibitors, visitors and journalists on hand for opening day.

The pilot, 37-year-old Anatoly Kvochur, was airlifted by helicopter to hospital near the airfield, then transferred to Begun Military Hospital in a suburb east of the city. The Soviet Embassy in Paris said he was in "fairly good health."

Claude Martin, night director of the show, said Kvochur's parachute "barely opened, but even so it broke the fall of the pilot."

Alexander Batkov, Soviet department chief for the Ministry of Aviation Industry, said in Paris that Kvochur is "one of our best pilots."

No immediate cause was given for the crash. Batkov said it was only the second MiG-29 ever to crash.

# SIS could lead to full-scale weapons plant

**TWIN FALLS** - A laser-driven plutonium refinery would be the first step in moving a government nuclear weapons plant to Idaho, a state senator says.

"Rocky Flats is being moved to Idaho," Sen. Brian Donesley, D-Boise, said, in a telephone interview Thursday.

The Colorado weapons plant, which makes plutonium triggers for nuclear warheads, is located about 14 miles from Denver. Government officials want to move

the plant because it's too dangerous, Donesley said.

"It's too dangerous for Denver, it's too dangerous for us," he said.

Donesley was one of seven elected Idaho officials who signed a letter urging Congress to divert Special Isotope Separator construction money to radioactive-waste cleanup at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

"We are also aware that the placement of this plutonium processing facility in Idaho may influence future decisions concerning the relocation of the Rocky Flats, Colorado

plutonium processing operations," the letter says.

"We feel strongly that the Department of Energy must decide, with full public participation, where to relocate the Rocky Flats operations before expending over a billion dollars on plutonium processing facilities in Idaho."

In addition to Donesley, the letter was signed by Sens. John Peverly, D-Coeur d'Alene; Mary Lou Reed, D-Coeur d'Alene; and John C. Stocks, D-Coeur d'Alene; Reps. Deanna Vickers, D-Lewislaton, and Ken Robinson, D-Boise; and Ketchum Mayor Lawrence J. Young.

It was addressed to U.S. Rep. John Spratt, D-S.C., chairman of the House Armed Services Subcommittee on Nuclear Proliferation and Military Nuclear Systems.

"We urge you to eliminate all funding for site preparation and construction of the Special Isotope Separator plutonium refinery at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory," the letter says.

The signers want Congress to know that not all elected Idaho officials support the

## Organic farming has paid off for the Ihlers

**FILER** - On a small patch of fertile ground near here, the Ihler family is quietly doing its part to change the way America farms.

When a growth-regulating chemical called Alar made headlines this year as a potential health hazard and grocers yanked apples from their counters, the Ihlers shook their heads with an I-told-

you-so smile.

When their potato-farming neighbors panicked at a recent government report questioning the safety of aldicarb, a widely used insecticide, the Ihlers weren't surprised.

"Agriculture is in the dark ages," said Rick Ihler.

The Ihlers - brothers Rick and Terry and their father, Dick - have preached for years that the path to agricultural enlightenment lies in organic farming and

away from pesticides and chemical fertilizers. Suddenly people seem to be listening - even in conservative regions like these irrigated drylands, where new farming ideas run up against deep-rooted traditions.

A Louis Harris poll conducted in November for Organic Gardening magazine said 84 percent of Americans said they would buy organically grown food if it was available, and 49 percent would pay more for it.

More mainstream farmers - jolted by consumers' concerns, rising chemical costs and depleted soils - are taking a second look at a farming approach they once dismissed as a fad practiced by sundi-wearing hippies.

The Ihlers made the switch to organic farming in 1981. They had been farming more than 4,000 acres, most of it on rented land. Like many farmers, they depended on bank loans to make it from one harvest

## Attorneys call for mistrial in mushroom suit

**HAILY** - Angry Bliss Valley attorneys called for a mistrial Thursday in the mushroom trial after Idaho First National Bank produced a memo contradicting the testimony of one of their witnesses.

The memo, stating an Idaho First official recalled Bliss Valley threatening court action unless it received an additional \$7 million loan, was shown to jurors before attorneys could object.

"I'm outraged," objected Bliss Valley attorney Jack Gjording. "I want this document out. I want it out. I want it cured, or I want a mistrial."

Attorney Dick Greiner added, "This is grounds for a mistrial."

After an hour of deliberation and arguments, 5th District Court Judge James May denied the motions for mistrial.

The memo, the motions and the flurry of objections, which bounced the jury in and out of the courtroom all day, were the result of clashing testimonies between a bank officer and a consultant hired by Bliss Valley.

Bank Vice President Ed Conforti testified last week and reiterated Thursday that attorneys and consultants for Bliss Valley threatened during a meeting on Jan. 18, 1988, with bank officials "hard-core litigation" unless the bank loan the mushroom farm an additional \$7 million and relieve all investors of any liability on the current debt.

Douglas Gowen, the consultant hired by Bliss Valley for the negotiations, denied Thursday such a discussion occurred in the January 1988 meeting. He said he had no

## USFS looks again at Baker Creek ski area

**KETCHUM** - The Forest Service has dusted off a plan for a new downhill ski area north of Ketchum that, if developed, could offer a better natural snow base than Bald Mountain.

Bald Mountain's operator, the Sun Valley Co., has expressed interest in developing the area, but a local critic of the company wants the company barred from the project.

The site is 16 miles north of Ketchum, in

the Baker Creek Drainage near the Big Wood River west of State Highway 75.

Although the Forest Service maintains that the possibility of reviving the old Butterfield ski area (also called Bigwood) years away if it is developed at all, a study commissioned by Sawtooth National Recreation Area officials finds the concerns that led to cancellation of the downhill ski area 14 years ago may no longer be valid, Carl Pence, SNRA Area Manager, said.

Pence said the primary reasons the Forest Service reimbursed a developer \$30,000 for improvements and canceled its

permit in 1975 included:

- Ketchum and other nearby communities could not accommodate further development.
  - Need to develop another ski area was undemonstrated.
  - Sewage treatment facilities were inadequate.
- A report by business consultant Jeff Lubeck finds most of those concerns are without substance today.
- However, Lubeck did cite a concern for the water quality of the Big Wood River.

## Face-lift will save low-income housing funds

**TWIN FALLS** - A low-income housing subdivision is getting a face-lift this summer that could help lower operating expenses.

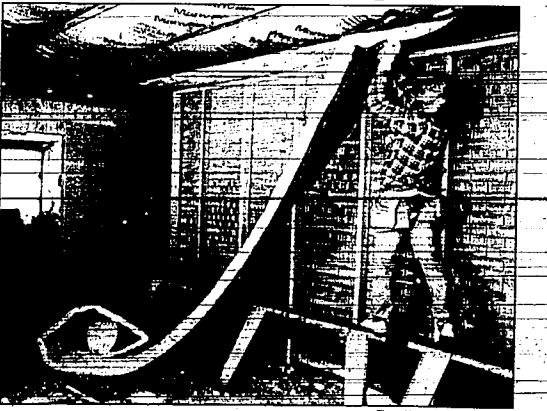
"We've been real fortunate in getting federal grants to modernize," said Charles Capps, director of the Twin Falls Housing Authority.

# Deputy warden testifies in 'Shorty' Araiza trial

**BOISE (AP)** — A deputy warden says he caught glimpses of a short Hispanic inmate apparently stabbing prisoner Richard Holmes to death last fall during an Idaho State Penitentiary riot.

Jay Heusser testified Thursday in the Rodney "Shorty" Araiza murder trial that he saw the pair twirling in combat across the length of Holmes' cell.

"They fought throughout the whole room," Heusser told the 4th District Court jury.

The witness and other officers observed portions of the Sept. 25 fatal attack through a narrow opening in a metal-battered and mesh-screened cell window.

They were about a dozen feet away, behind a chain-link security fence. "I heard him go down on the concrete (floor). He hit hard," Heusser said of the victim.

The attacker immediately knelt and began stabbing with what appeared to be a 10-inch steel blade, the deputy warden said.

# Filer considers pornography restrictions

**FILER** - The zoning board here will discuss at its meeting later this month ways to restrict the sale of pornography.

The board wants a city ordinance prohibiting sales within the city limits. Chairwoman Twila Knutson told the City Council Tuesday.

City Attorney Fred Decker said the city can't unreasonably restrict such an establishment, but can prohibit sales within set distances of residential areas, possibly effectively eliminating the business within the city limits.

The ordinance would have to be specific on where the businesses would be allowed, Decker said.

Knutson said the board hasn't discussed "what those distances might be. The board will discuss the issue at 8 p.m. June 27 in the City Hall conference room."

Mayor Bob Forte said he favors some kind of ordinance concerning the sale of pornography. "It's still better to have an ordinance, something to protect us the best we can, rather than none at all," Forte said.

Decker told board members not to expect an ordinance that would guarantee the prohibition of the sale of pornography in the city limits.

"Nobody has one that's bullet proof right now," he said. "The city will work extra hours next month to make Filer a cleaner place to live. City workers will haul from alleys away sinks, refrigerators and other household items July 17-19. Mayor Forte announced."

Bud Compher, city public works director, said that crews picked up only half as many loads last year as the previous year. No garbage will be collected by the city, Compher said. R & R Disposal will collect

garbage on regular days, he said. Crews will work from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. at three days. Additional information may be obtained by calling 326-5001.

In other action:

- Responding to council concerns for an ordinance dealing with the sale of fireworks, Decker said state law should address the concerns. Businesses are required to obtain a permit from the fire chief and display the permit within their business. Fireworks can not be sold until June 15, statewide. Decker said the state defines permissible fireworks very tightly. State law also gives the city the right to inspect the businesses for compliance.

- The council approved the Friday night street dance downtown to kick off Filer Fun-Days. Last year's dance went well with no incidences, Police Chief Don Barkley said. "People kept the beer inside and the dancing outside," he said. The dance,

with country music, begins at 7 p.m. July 28.

- Bikers in the Ore-Ida Women's Challenge Bike Race are expected to go through the town between 12:30-12:50 p.m. July 1 on the Bliss-Twin Falls trip. Fire police will control the starting race, he said.

- A local competition between the fire department and high school basketball team earned \$220, with half going to the Filer marquee and half to the high school athletic club, Compher said. Compher said the department hopes to make the event an annual fund-raiser.

The money donated to the marquee is still about \$2,100 short of the amount needed for the purchase, Knutson said. The marquee, slated for the highway east of town, is designed to present messages to travelers. Donations and additional information is available at City Hall.

# Rupert decides not to donate drug-abuse funds

**RUPERT** - The City Council decided against donating funds toward the organization of a drug-abuse group but pledged free meeting space if the group forms.

Mayor Bill Whitton read a letter from Charles "Lucky" Bourn, representing a citizen's committee wishing to begin a Minidoka County chapter of Parents And Youths Against Drug Abuse.

The letter stated a need to raise funds for the group. The organization is a national non-profit organization with its state governing body in Boise.

Of the \$700 needed, \$200 has already been pledged by local businesses. The money would pay for bringing experts from Boise for eight weekly training sessions, and construction of a tamper-proof display cases of various drugs.

The organization concentrates on education in identifying drugs, paraphernalia and abusers, but not in the treatment of substance abusers. Assistance will be given to direct parents and youths to professional treatment programs.

Council members on Tuesday unanimously approved of the group formation but said they were concerned about numerous requests for donations for various fund-raisers if the city allocated money for this.

They offered city office space for the group's meetings. The group hopes to begin classes in October or November. People

wishing to donate can do so at West One Bank in Rupert, or they may call Jack Bour at 336-6160 for more information.

In other matters, Councilman Joel Rogers will look into complaints about an abnormal number of accidents and near-accidents at the intersection of 100 W. and 100 N. streets.

"I talked with local residents who said they heard the sound of screeching brakes all too often," Rogers said. "About one-third resulted in accidents, about one-third resulted in vehicles landing in the ditch, and about one-third of the cars managed to stop in time."

No specific figures were available from the county.

Public Works Director Eric Peterson asked that more bids be submitted for needed repairs on the 43rd mainstem road. The single bid received apparently was too high. The city would like to have the work done before next winter.

In other action, the council approved a bid of \$3,662 by Robbin Dayley Construction Co. for the Big Valley School sidewalk project. Construction is slated to begin this summer.

Approved Evelyn Dunn as the newest library board member. Anyone interested in the vacant seat on the zoning board should contact any city official.

Continued from Page B1 on grass as a shortcut, Capps said.

Uniform watering with the sprinkling system will conserve water that people waste when they turn their hoses on at one spot and leave them there all day, he said.

"It pays off," Capps said. The authority's heating bill for 140 senior-citizen apartments was \$20,000 a year cheaper after new windows and insulation were installed, he said.

This year's remodeling project is the eighth in 10 years on the housing authority's apartments. Last year, a \$504,000 grant paid to replace kitchen and bathroom floors,

kitchen faucets, water pipes, toilets, furnaces and doors in the 43-year-old apartments. The housing authority also refinished and painted walls. "We go to keep working on them or they will deteriorate," Capps said. Tenants pay a lump sum for rent and utilities, which is about 30 percent of their income.

"Rent is based on income," Capps said. An individual earning less than \$15,000 is eligible to live in the development. A family of eight, in contrast, can pay up to \$36,000. The subdivision has a three-to-four-month waiting list that is about 30 families long, Capps said.

**TWIN FALLS** — The whole difference in the 1989 Magic-Valley Shrine All-Star Football Game was that the West had a safety net.

No matter how many turnovers, penalties, execution mistakes the West offense made, the East couldn't take advantage of it because the defense was totally dominant. And so, when the offense started gelling in the second half, the final score of 22-2 was perhaps as kind as it could have been. The game, attracting a good crowd to the benefit of the Shriners' Crippled Children in

Salt Lake City, sent the West ahead 7-5 in the 12-year history of the all-star event. As usual, the game was decided in the trenches where because of size and ability the West was expected to have the advantage it showed.

"We did OK in the first half," said East line coach Gordon Hogan of Kimberly. "But then the physical thing got us. They four Twin Falls kids (Jim Rhoades, Dan McKay, Jonathan McCall and Brady Sands) and the (Ben) Miller kid from Buhl just ate us alive in the second half."

"They were just much more physical than us, especially in the last half," echoed head coach Rod Malone of Valley. "Our kids just

wore out and couldn't handle what the West was passing out. They really started dominating the line in the last quarter, blowing us backward on every play."

It was just as well for the West because in the first half its own propensity for self-destruction and the stubbornness of the East kept it close to an exciting game.

In the first two quarters, the West turned the ball over five times — once inside its own 10-yard line — picked up 55 yards in eight penalties and at intermission had run just 20 plays for 130 yards.

Almost all of that came, however, on the second halfing by West quarterback Duncan Farris of Glenns Ferry. Farris kept on

a roll-out, cut-back-against-the-flow, maintained his balance with a hand to the ground and then sailed 87 yards to paydirt. That eased the sting of his game-opening play — an interception.

The West turned it over twice on its next four offensive scrimmages. But all that came to naught as the West defense knocked East runners down for losses on 13 of the 33 plays the East got off. The East had 52 yards in 33 plays at intermission.

It looked awfully familiar when Glenns Ferry's Ross Kook fumbled to the East two plays into the second half. But again the defense held and this time Farris got the sput-

• A public relations junket in Memphis for 300 film and music reporters, June 15-18.

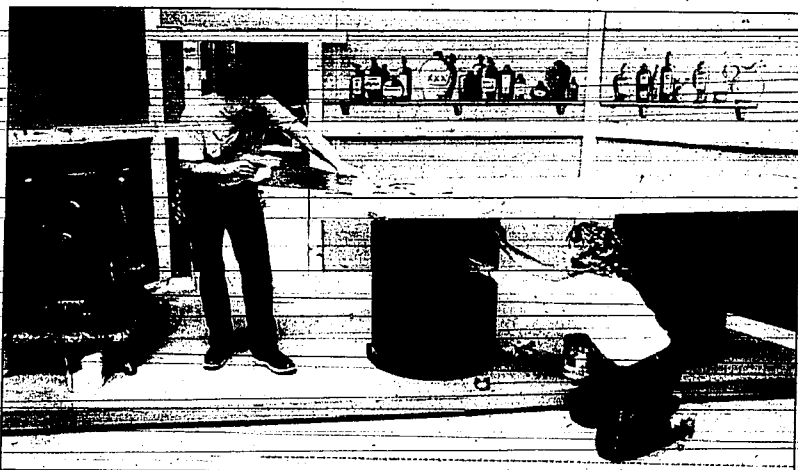

**JEROME**— Theater fans who didn't get their fill of Western-Days festivities last weekend can continue whooping it up at Jerome High School, where the Northside Playhouse will stage "Paint Your Wagon" starting tonight.

Penned by musical masters Alan Jay Lerner and Frederick Loewe, "Wagon" traces the quest for gold in northern California during the 1800s.

The show was first staged on Broadway in 1951. Among the most famous songs from

the score are "I Talk to the Trees" and "They Call the Wind Maria."

Starring in the Northside production are Gary Dalton as Ben Rumson and Cindy Black as Jennifer Rumson. Both are from Jerome. Other prominent players in the 35-member cast include Dan Mink, Larry Larson, Maria Larson, Linda Stevenson, Bruce Whitehead and Catherine Plym.

Liz Nutting, who was among Northside Playhouse's founders back in 1981, believes "Wagon" was an inspired choice for the city's presentation. For one thing, she notes the tie-in with Western-Days.

In addition, the production has proven a

big draw for theatrically inclined men in the Magic Valley. In past years, the Playhouse has often had a tough time getting men to audition for roles, but the guys came out in force for the "Wagon" casting call. Nutting says the mucho appeal may have stemmed from the 1969 film version of "Paint Your Wagon" that starred Clint Eastwood and Lee Marvin.

Director Mike Winterholler, a veteran Magic Valley theater figure, says preparations for "Paint Your Wagon" have been as much fun as they've been work.

In recent years, he explains, the Playhouse has become more professional.

"I don't have trouble anymore finding talent—it grows out of the woodwork," says Winterholler.

Theater work is the cement of one friendship that was fostered long before this production. The three men responsible for set design for "Paint Your Wagon" have known each other and worked together since childhood.

Winterholler, John Pletz and Danny Boyd spent two weeks working five or six hours a night to complete the sets. The pieces were built at Norco in Twin Falls and moved to Jerome in a truck donated by Ford.

## Traveling Navajo hits the road for his artform

It is how the family worships its creator

**TWIN FALLS**— Because visitors to the Southwest's vast Navajo reservation are not permitted to witness the tribe's sandpainting ritual, Mitchell Silas travels the nation, demonstrating the artform for all.

Silas and his family were in Twin Falls this week to offer a sandpainting demonstration at the New Beginnings Center. Sponsored by the Earthrise Institute, the program was the third and last in a series on "The Spirit of the American Indian."

"This is our way of worshipping our creator on the Navajo reservation, Silas said. He recited a prayer in his tribal language before beginning, then knelt down, bending over his canvases on the floor to create "The Song of the Sun Creation."

Grains flowed fluidly from his hand, filtering swiftly between his thumb and forefinger to fill the painting's broadest expanses of color. For smaller details, he placed mere pinches of sand in precise locations.

As he worked, Silas' wife Robin offered readings on the use of sandpainting in Navajo healing. Her words were interspersed with those of Earthrise Institute co-director Harry Massoth, who said teachings of the Baha'i faith, a religion that has attracted hundreds of Navajo, including Silas.

Silas told his audience of about 30 people

he started working with medicine men in the sandpainting ritual at age 13. "I was drinking a lot then, and it wasn't very important to me," he explained. Asked how he happened to be picked to learn sandpainting, he said laughingly, "I was just there at the wrong time."

Five years later, when Silas was still involved in drugs and alcohol, a medicine man told him his life would change. Some time later, he discovered the Baha'i faith.

A tenet of the religion teaches the unity of all humanity, and Silas decided sandpainting would be one way to bring that message to many people. Now 33, Silas has been traveling across the United States for about four years, speaking to Baha'i groups as well as to schools, workshops and other gatherings.

In Navajo ritual, medicine men direct the sandpaintings, but Silas' own inspiration provides the ideas for the paintings he does in the public demonstrations.

In the painting he created here, Silas used a figure with horns to convey lightning and what he called "the healing power of the sun." Feathers represented prayers, rainbows symbolized protection and lines extending from the figure's head stood for life itself.

In sandpaintings done as ritual, only five colors are all sacred to the Navajo — are used: white, yellow, black, red and blue. "The colors symbolize directions, Silas said, but he also was struck by how the hues represented the different races of people on

"I drove up the driveway to my old house and was so appalled at what had been done to it that I turned around and drove away."

Kay Gable protected her son from the press and other intruders, sending him to private schools Buckley in West Los Angeles and Brooks Prep in Andover, Mass. "She didn't like the way people handled interviews, and she wanted

Wren will display a series of large formal watercolor florals and a selection of Western impressions.

The Oje Gallery, at 380 Leadville Ave. across from Louie's Restaurant, exclusively displays the work of artist Joseph Kinnebrew. This show will highlight his hand-painted

summer apparel. His sculptures, canvases, graphic designs and hand-painted furniture and linens are also displayed.

The second invitational show will exhibit a variety of fine art jewelry, including dramatic pieces by artists new to the gallery — Mary Hughes and Charlie Buck.

## Author of one-man Hemingway play will speak at Sun Valley arts center

KETCHUM — John De Groot, author of "Papa," the new highly acclaimed one-man play about Ernest Hemingway, will speak at the Sun Valley Center for the Arts and Humanities on June 12 at 7 p.m.

The talk, with which De Groot hopes to generate lively discussion, is entitled "An Insecure Man: Century Male Looks at Ernest Hemingway."

De Groot won a Pulitzer Prize as a part of the Akron Beacon Journal team covering the shooting of anti-war demonstrators at Kent State University in 1970.

In "Papa," De Groot has written what was initially an effort to sort out his own life.

"If time warp had given me the opportunity, I would have dragged Ernest Hemingway to an AA meet-

ing," says De Groot, a recovering alcoholic.

In 1983, De Groot attended a Hemingway Days Festival at Key West, Fla. It disturbed him that the sensi-

tive and gifted man who died of alcoholism was honored in an annual drunken orgy devoted to macho wars, wrestling and beer drinking.

Having recently lost his father to emphysema, De Groot felt an urgent need to explore his feelings about his father, as well as Hemingway's need for parental love, his inability to find intimacy, and the machismo coloration he used to project his emotional shortcomings.

From that time in 1983, De Groot proceeded to assemble a research library of more than 200 books by and about Hemingway. His research also included travels to Cuba and the Bahamas and he was given access to the once-classified file the FBI kept on Hemingway. Five years later "Papa" emerged.

It was De Groot's wish that the play be performed at the local junior college in Fort Lauderdale. At friends' insistence, the play was sub-

mitted to the Tennessee Williams Playwrights Festival, winning the competition. "Papa" may be Broadway bound.

The play, a one-man show featuring George Peppard, also a recovering alcoholic with more than 30 years of acting experience, has been at the Marines Memorial Theatre in San Francisco and the Royal George Theatre in Chicago, with an initial engagement in Boise, home of the Hemingway Library.

The portrait that De Groot offers in the production is that of a proud, but ruined man.

His script carefully avoids conclusions but instead rekindles for the audience fascination for the complex and mysterious power of Hemingway; a man who courted danger with a passion but confessed to being unable to sleep without the light.

## Soul music exported to U.S. from London

The best of black music has roots that can easily be traced to American cities like Memphis, Detroit, Philly or New Orleans. But now the English, loyal fans of American soul, are exporting their own brand of soul music.

Two young black acts from South London, Nica Paris and a group called Roachford, have conquered the charts in Great Britain are trying to repeat their successes in the United States.

Paris and Roachford have recently released debut albums in the United States and both are embarking on their first North American tours. "It's kind of like starting over again," said group leader Andrew Roachford, 24, in a recent telephone interview.

But already the melodic rock of his "Cuddly Toy" has enjoyed an MTV "Hip Clip of the Week" designation and has been moving up pop charts; word of exciting live shows precedes him. Roachford denies that there are many similarities among the new wave of English artists. "We are all from South London. We

are all fairly successful and we are all black. The similarity stops there, really.

The music is not that similar. The approach is different," he said. "Everybody calls it a new movement in South London, but I just did what I'm doing."

For Paris, the reason has to do with the rise of second-generation black Londoners.

Both artists credit the variety of music they listened to as they grew up. While Roachford was still in college, a cohort of the Clash first discovered him for an ambitious new label. The Clash was going to start with the proceeds from its success — "England's answer to Motown," he recalls.

His own album with his band, which includes Chris Taylor on drums, Hawk Gonde on guitar and Basia Taylor on bass, languished for a while before it caught on. The singles "Family Man" and "Cuddly Toy" fared the first time they were released in 1983.

But after the band toured extensively, opening for Terence Trent D'Arby, the singles became chart-toppers when they were released

again early this year.

"A lot of touring with Terence Trent D'Arby started a good while going," he said.

# Renegades is a heap bad medicine show

"Renegades" is so routine you'd think it was an exercise video you'd see 10,000 times. It's not about that much personality. It's a languidly recombining four or five thoroughly tarnished clichés from the cop movie tradition, it turns out loud, stupid, mildly energetic and so unconvincing that it could be a bad joke.

It's yet another wrinkle on the by-now well-rumpled buddy cloth, frat pack division, yoking Lou Diamond Phillips (who's cool) to Kiefer Sutherland (who's not in a quest for a homicidal gangster through the streets of Philadelphia. But, see, here's the "original" part: Phillips, with his trapezoidal head and his lank black hair, is a Lakota Indian who's on the case because the killer, who not only swiped six million in diamonds, also serendipitously swiped the ceremonial spear of the Lakota tribe. He had medicine.

There's a little potential in this R-rated film, an art instrument developed by director Jack Sholder, who had much better luck on the zany-violent "Hidden." More depressingly, this is yet another trope from

the world of boring white men that holds that people of color have special "spiritual values" and are thus

"In tune with nature" and closer to its secrets. Uh-huh. So when Kiefer Sutherland catches a 9 millimeter bullet, through what appears to be the spleen and liver, it only takes a medicine man to stand over him with some smoldering incense and chant "hum-a-hum-a-hum-a-hey-a-hey-a-hey" a few times and the wound magically disappears. Powerful medicine.

None of the pieces really fit together. For example, Sutherland is featured as an undercover cop who has penetrated the gang because he knows that the evil leader (Rob Knepper, who is spooky) has a cop in his pocket.

Sutherland wants the crooked cop, see, but nothing is ever made of what it is the crooked cop does for the gangster that makes him so dangerous. And how could Sutherland let a horribly violent robbery occur — three deaths, but I may have

missed a corpse or two — and call himself a police officer.

At that point he can arrest the gangster, who is more important than the cop, no?

And the business with the "ceremonial spear" is equally sketchy. When the robbery collapses (through no effort of Sutherland's) and degenerates into a running

This is an interesting quirk, but again the movie does nothing with it. When it reappears at the end of the film — gee, guess how the bad guy dies, folks — you wonder what it is. It's simply hasn't become a part of Knepper's personality.

The robbery-car chase lasts for about seven minutes and has about a tenth the verve that is found in Indiana Jones's littles left toe, and the gunfights are completely banal; the violence doesn't have any punchy stylization to give the movie a zinky kick.

As for the two young men, Phillips comes more or less unscathed, he's graceful, dignified and has the curious and welcome talent to carry scenes in which he doesn't open his mouth. By contrast, poor Sutherland is a hopeless lightweight. He talks and seems remotely real as a cop.

## Field of Dreams a holy sacrament

**FIELD OF DREAMS (PG)** A movie about crazy dreams and impossible ruminations. "Field of Dreams" presents baseball as a kind of national sacrament, an instrument of neat-happy reconciliation between the generations — with Kevin Costner as an ex-campus radical and Iowa farmer who receives heavenly instructions to construct a diamond in his cornfield and await some mysterious visitations: it is probably as heartfelt a movie as any major studio has given us recently, but the heartland setting is a little too underpopulated, the populist parable a little too bald, and the political conflicts avoided or softened. The movie doesn't quite reach the magical, Capra-esque fusion of fable and fantasy it wants.

**K-9 (PG-13)** A routine cops-and-robbers pilot gets a fresh spin when James Belushi, playing a headstrong San Diego marauder detective gets a smart, unpredictable German shepherd (Jerry Lee) for his new partner. With Mel Harris.

**MAJOR LEAGUE (R)** David Ward's amiable, amusing baseball comedy, which turns upon the fact that the Cleveland Indians haven't won a pennant since 1954 — and which affords enjoyable, ingratiating performances from Tom Berenger, Charlie Sheen, Corbin Bernsen, James Gammon and numerous others. A modest winner about a bunch of supposed losers.

**PET SEMATARY (R)** Director Mary Lambert and Stephen King, in adapting his own novel, have created a piece of Americana at its most Gothic, a depiction of a normal family made vulnerable by the eternal yearning to cheat death. A numbing, chilling vision, and not to everyone's taste, for sure.

**PINK CADILLAC (PG-13)** Another Clint Eastwood Saturday night special, filled with salty violence and cool humor, unwinding in a highway-threaded Southwest terrain packed with sprites, squares, and maniacs and oddballs.

**INDIANA JONES AND THE LAST CRUSADE (PG-13)** We are told that this is the last movie with an Indian. It follows a headlong race for the Holy Grail, the lifelong obsession of Indy's estranged medievalist father portrayed by Sean Connery. Both Harrison Ford and Connery play their "I never told him I loved him" moments full-out and unabashedly, and they alternate them with good, aerobic, air-clearing bits of accusation and grouting. But Spielberg plunges into some scenes with such a perfunctory set-up that he catches his audience unprepared. It may be in the spirit of the hero myth, but you can't blame audiences for wondering where the harm would be in a splendid partner to accompany the lads into the sunset, a sort of 1938 Lauren Hutton.

# ABC's newest Friday night sitcom full of fun, giggles and boy-chasing

They giggle. They chase boys. They lie up the phone. They do their makeup. They redo their makeup. They chase more boys. And they never, ever stop giggling. For any one who has a teen-age daughter, or has been a teen-age daughter, it's a familiar and frenzied scenario. This season, ABC's Friday-night family sitcom "Just the Ten of Us" has become the prime-time epicenter of adolescent giggling and boy chasing. Four of the eight children of high school basketball coach Graham Lubbock (Bill Kirchenbauer) and his wife Elizabeth (Deborah Harmon) are teen-age girls. Dad teaches at an all-boys school, so there's plenty of trouble with these angels!

Nineteen-year-old Brooke Theiss, who plays daughter Wendy, feels that the teen quartet has a lot to do with the enormous ratings popularity of the show.

"I feel that teen-age girls can really relate to the girls on the show," she says. "We're all different. Connie (Jo Ann Willette), who is the youngest, is neurotic and believes pain is good. She's destined to be a writer. Wendy, who's me, (giggle) eggs everyone on to make trouble (giggle).

I'm a real troublemaker. Wendy's fraternal twin Cindy (Jamie Luner) is real dumb, a real Chrissy Snow (the Suzanne Somers character on "Three's Company"). Marie (Heather Langenkamp) is the real good, godly one."

While a family of this size, which also includes three brothers and a younger sister, seems it would be perfect prime-time drama fodder, the Lubbocks are a sitcom family. "It really is a fun show," says Theiss. "And there really aren't many large families around these days. I think people like to see a large loving family because that's what families are about — love. And that's what our show is about."

Theiss clearly sees the fantasy element in the show, "because I'm from a broken home. My parents are divorced." But she's quick to point out that her family, which includes a brother, "is a real loving family." Theiss' mother, Kathy Mitchell, with whom she lives, is a former actress and model who appeared on "Playhouse 90." Her mother loathed the idea of being a stage mother, but young Brooke persisted in her own dreams. "I'd see commercials on TV, so I would take something out of the kitchen and sell it in the bathroom mirror."

When Theiss was 12, her mother finally related, and she signed with a commercial agent. Years later, while a freshman at New York University (she's currently on leave), she won a

commercial contract to represent Hasbro's Maxie doll for five years.

"Maxie's just a little younger than Barbie," Theiss says. "She's the kind of girl who has one step to getting a boyfriend. She stays with her friends. She hangs out in a mall and shops. Kids worship Maxie. When I go out (on personal appearances), kids run around and touch my hair and clothes."

Theiss did a guest shot on "Growing Pains" (from which "Just the Ten of Us" was spun off) and feels that her role in this show is her breakthrough role. She plans to keep acting ("Meryl Streep is my idol"), but she would also like to get married. "I'd love to have six kids and have the kind of house where everyone comes over and hangs out together."

"Julia and Mason should be happy for five minutes," says Nancy Lee Grahn (Julia), who is up for a Supporting Actress Daytime Emmy Award, one of 13 nominations earned by the soap. Nancy claims she had better material last year (when she wasn't nominated), so she expects "All My Children's" Debbi Morgan to win.

But the Emmy attention won't hurt. Nancy turned down three features last season, proof that people respond to controlled Julia's attempts to harness alcoholic Mason Capwell, an eccentric with memory problems, a roving eye and other weaknesses.

Playing Julia since the soap's opening day, she has always been the reactor to Mason's latest dilemma. Since her father died of alcoholism, Julia usually expects the worst from Mason and is seldom disappointed.

"I'm interested in drama that's real. I don't do the fake stuff very well," Nancy declares. As a result, Julia's reactions to hard drinking Mason have a note of authenticity, because Nancy happens to be the daughter of a recovering alcoholic.

"With an alcoholic parent, one out of two children will inherit the disease," says Nancy. "I'm one of them. I try and spread the word. Alcoholism is a family disease. It affects the whole unit. Like Julia caring for Mason, the wife spends so much time on a drinking husband, she forgets about the susceptible kids. I wish we would do more on the kids. It's an ideal subject for daytime."

With Lane Davies (Mason Capwell) leaving the show shortly, Nancy has no clues about the future. What she does have is

many ideas for her character: "I wish Julia would lose some of her control. I'd like to see the lady really screw up and reveal her insecurities. Her past is shaky, and she covers up being the daughter of a drinker, for instance. We did a short piece on that, but it's still unfinished business."

"Always a loser against 'General Hospital' in the afternoon, 'Santa Barbara' sends a message to NBC with all those Emmy nominations. 'Move the soap!'"

"Fans like the ABC lineup. It's hard to beat," Nancy acknowledges. "Why can't we follow 'Days of Our Lives'?"

Brown has become a solid, accepted figure in jail, where he leads the jail's choir. A: That incident was reported some two years ago, but it never happened. In fact, the rock star just collected nearly \$200,000 in a libel judgment against the publication that printed it. George is giving his winnings to charity.

## Survey: Most viewers would back boycott of firms that sponsor objectionable shows

NEW YORK (AP) — Most Americans would support advertisers that withdraw commercials from TV programs that some viewers find objectionable, and they would back a boycott of companies that sponsor such shows, a survey says.

One in four respondents said the government should make it illegal to show objectionable material on television, according to the survey released Thursday

by the consumer research firm Oxtoby-Smith Inc.

Respondents were asked to describe what they regarded as objectionable and 74 percent cited excessive violence, 67 percent sex, 60 percent profanity, 58 percent cited "subjects that should be private" and 41 percent ethnic stereotypes.

Joseph Smith, president of Oxtoby-Smith, said those calls appear to have "touched a sensi-

tive, pervasive and perhaps festering public concern.

But some advertising and television executives questioned the significance of the poll's findings, noting that how a question is phrased may have a lot to do with how it is answered.

They said, for instance, that people who say they support withdrawing ads from an "objectionable" show may disagree on what is objectionable.

# NBC moves to 52-week 'season'

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC Entertainment President Brandon Tartikoff is exercising his preference for original programming year-round by putting on three new series and bringing back new "Highway to Heaven" episodes this summer.

As usual, and despite evidence that the networks are losing viewers to cable and videocassettes, most summer TV fare will consist of reruns.

CBS is introducing one new comedy series, though, "Doctor, Doctor," this month. And ABC will air new episodes of "Hooperman," and otherwise rearrange its schedule. In August, ABC will premiere the new Diane Sawyer-Sam Donaldson news-magazine, tentatively titled "Prime Time." ABC will also have prime-time baseball on Thursdays in June and July.

NBC, which is so successful it barely had any room for new shows on its fall schedule, is using the preseason to give air time to some new products. No air dates have been set, but two of the new shows on tap, most likely to premiere in August, are:

• "Knight and Day," starring Jack Warden ("Crazy Like a Fox") and Mason Adams ("Lou Grant") as a one-time radio act reluctantly reunited after 40 years. Hope Lange plays Adams' wife. The series comes from Lowell Ganz and Babaloo Mandell, who wrote "Laverne and Shirley" and the hit movie "Splash."

• "13 East," set in a hospital and starring Diana Bellamy as a supervising nurse and Ellen Regan as a trainee.

One other half-hour comedy, yet to be picked from among shows in development for NBC, will also make a bow this summer, while "Highway to Heaven," the hour drama starring Michael Landon as an Earth-roving angel, will return with 10 new episodes. It was absent this past season.

ABC is basically in the business

of rearranging deck chairs this summer, giving "Coach" a shot at a better time period on Tuesdays after "Roseanne." "Hooperman" will return June 14 in the Wednesday time period vacated by "Coach," which makes its move June 20, bumping "Have Faith," which will move to Sundays, filling half of the hour left empty by the cancellation of "Moonlighting." Phew. "Thursday Night Baseball" premieres June 8 and runs through July 27 in the time periods now populated by canceled shows.

CBS is expected to once again let viewers see the really bad stuff that didn't even make it to air by reviving the "CBS Summer Playhouse," a weekly display of busted pilots.

But the network will add one new show. "Doctor, Doctor," a

comedy starring Matt Frewer ("Max Headroom") as an idealistic young M.D. trying to cope with the pressures of high-tech medical care. It premieres Monday, June 12, in the "Kate & Allie" time period. "Kate & Allie" will move to 8 p.m. EDT, replacing the canceled "Live In."

On cable, HBO is launching this month "Tales from the Crypt," an anthology horror series. On July 8, Showtime is premiering "The Boys," a series from a pilot that aired last season. It stars Norm Crosby, Norman Fell, Jackie Gayle and Lionel Stander as the colorful members of a Friars Club-type men's club that was just jolted by the arrival of the court-ordered first female member (Janet Carroll). Steve Levitt plays the youngest member of the group.

## 'Shannon's Deal' breaks into top 10

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC isn't tipping its hand yet on the future of "Shannon's Deal," but the critically praised pilot about a burned-out corporate lawyer with a gambling problem landed in the top 10 in the Nielsen's last week.

Written by independent filmmaker John Sayles ("Eight Men Out"), the two-hour pilot aired as NBC's Sunday movie last week. It ranked 10th in the A.C. Nielsen Co. ratings, in a tie with CBS' "60 Minutes."

"Shannon's Deal" had a 14.5 rating and 25 share. NBC is considering a possible short-term run for the series, but it is not on the fall schedule.

It aired opposite "The Tony Awards" on CBS, which had its lowest rating ever, a 9.3 and 16 share. The presentation of awards to top Broadway shows and performers ranked 50th in the Nielsen's.

NBC won the week ending June 4, its 50th in a row, with an average, prime-time rating of 12.7. ABC came in second with a 9.6. CBS had a 9.4

The summer doldrums have firmly set in, as indicated by three-network

audience share of 59, the lowest since Sept. 5, 1988, when it was 58.

## 'Shannon's Deal' breaks into top 10

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC isn't tipping its hand yet on the future of "Shannon's Deal," but the critically-praised pilot about a burned-out corporate lawyer with a gambling problem landed in the top 10 in the Nielsens last week.


Written by independent filmmaker John Sayles ("Eight Men Out"), the two-hour pilot aired as NBC's Sunday movie last week. It ranked 10th in the A.C. Nielsen Co. ratings, in a tie with CBS' "60 Minutes."

"Shannon's Deal" had a 14.5 rating and 25 share. NBC is considering a possible short-term run for the series, but it is not on the fall schedule.

It aired opposite "The Tony Awards" on CBS, which had its lowest rating ever, a 9.3 and 16 share. The presentation of awards to top Broadway shows and performers ranked 50th in the Nielsens.

NBC won the week ending June 4, its 50th in a row, with an average, prime-time rating of 12.7. ABC came in second with a 9.6. CBS had a 9.4.

The summer doldrums have firmly set in, as indicated by three-network audience share of 59, the lowest since Sept. 5, 1968, when it was 58.

## 13 PBS stations look to Pacific for program ties

**HOLLYWOOD** — Without a lot of fanfare, 13 major public television stations in the United States have banded together into a Pacific Rim Co-Production Association, with non-commercial TV networks in Australia, New Zealand and Canada. The venture is designed to stimulate cooperative programming among the four nations and already has two series in production.

The U.S. stations represent a cross-section of key public-TV outlets across the nation — including KCET in Los Angeles, KCTS in Seattle, WGBH in Boston, WNET in New York, and WETA in Washington, D.C.

The same stations also belong to the U.S. Public Television International Consortium, which pools resources to develop and produce PBS programs through international collaborations. The international consortium was formed about two years ago; six months later it established the Pacific Rim association.

"We felt there was an opportunity for co-production that had not been realized in the Pacific Rim," said

chairman Burnell F. Clark, president and chief executive officer of the Seattle's KCTS, "and that Australian Broadcasting Corp., Television New Zealand and the Canadian Broadcasting Corp. were our natural partners. People tend to think East and this is the European Century, but we are now entering the Pacific Century and we wanted to be on the cutting edge with this consortium."

Asked why Japan had not been included in the association, Clark said that the Pacific Rim stations wanted to "simplify the process; and didn't want language to be a barrier. We want to make the consortium work in terms of communication, and our intent is to eventually expand it."

David Stewart, director of international activities for the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, which helps support public radio and television with federal funds, said the member stations originally formed the international consortium "so that the stations could begin to speak with one voice" rather than operate independently as they often do with such co-producers as the British Broadcasting Corp.

## Station not required to tell viewers toy maker providing programming

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Communications Commission said Tuesday that a Los Angeles television station was not required to tell viewers that a toy maker was providing a children's program in exchange for advertising space.

The commission, in a ruling upholding the common industry practice of "barter" sales, denied a complaint that KCOP-TV should have identified Mattel Inc. and TV syndicator Group W Productions as sponsors of the cartoon show, "He-Man and the Masters of the Universe."

The Los-Angeles based National Association of Better Broadcasting had characterized the children's fantasy show as a non-stop depiction of the "He-Man" logo and "He-Man" toy products made by Mattel.

The association said the barter arrangement, whereby Mattel and Group W provided "He-Man" in exchange for two minutes of commercials distributed throughout KCOP's children's program schedule, constituted a "token payment, given the cost of producing the shows."

The association said the producers spent \$14 million to make 65 episodes of the program.

The association, in a 1984 complaint, said Section 317 of the 1934 Communications Act requires that sponsors be identified whenever shows are provided free or with only nominal payment.

But KCOP valued the commercial

time at \$300,000 a year. At the same time, it said that even if the payment were deemed "token," Section 317 does not require sponsor identification when the sponsors are mentioned incidentally or not at all in the broadcast.

The FCC in 1985 denied the complaint, which had been joined by Action for Children's Television. NABB appealed to the U.S. Court of Appeals in Washington, which in September 1987 remanded the case to the commission.

The FCC denied the complaint again Tuesday.

"I guess it would be amazing if they had voted any other way," Peggy Charren, head of Action for Children's Television, said of the 3-0 FCC ruling.

She said the problem of advertising messages slipped into TV programs was "one of the sorriest problems in all of broadcasting" and that the FCC was saying they are "going to let everything relax on the subject of advertising and editorial content."

NABB President Frank Orme said his group would continue the fight.

"Whatever they have done, the court will have to approve," Orme said by telephone from Los Angeles. "I think eventually we will win this."

Charren's group, which helped write a bill pending in Congress that would reimpose limits on the amount of commercials on kids' shows, had said various broadcasters were violating FCC regulations by airing "He-Man" and seven other programs

with substantial product tie-ins.

But the commission, in its 1985 rul-  
ing, said such shows were not  
program-length commercials. The  
commission said the broadcasters  
"had made a good faith determina-  
tion that 'He-Man' and the other  
challenged programs possessed sig-  
nificant entertainment value for  
child audiences."

The appeals court said the FCC  
had interpreted Section 317 incor-

rectly and it instructed the agency to  
devise a standard to determine if  
Section 317 covers barter arrange-  
ments.

In its ruling Tuesday, the FCC  
admitted it erred when it said  
Section 317 applied only to broad-  
casts that were purely commercial  
in content. As for determining a  
standard, it said KCOP clearly had  
paid more than a nominal fee for  
'He-Man,' and Section 317, therefore,  
did not apply.

 Stewart said that the Pacific Rim alliance was formed as a separate entity "to aggregate funds" among the four English-speaking nations. "The four countries can get involved in productions that no one of them could have done separately," Stewart said.

The two Pacific Rim projects now in production:

"Power in the Pacific," Australian Broadcasting is the senior partner, with KCET as the U.S. co-producer, in a \$1.5 million, four-part documentary about the shifting balance of military and economic power among Pacific Rim nations. "Power" will air on PBS in the fall of 1990.

"Fire on the Rim," KCTS in Seattle is the senior partner, working with Television New Zealand, in a four-part series exploring how the common threat of seismic and volcanic disasters, from earthquakes to tsunamis, affect the people and cultures of the Pacific. The \$1.3 million series is planned for national airing in the fall of 1991.

In the development stage are:  
 "Islands," a natural-history series from Television New Zealand that would explore life on the Pacific islands.

"Pacific-Rim in Performance," in which KCTA in St. Paul, Minn., would include in its "Alive From Off Center" series a one-hour program featuring performers from Pacific Rim nations.

Phyllis Galler, KCET's vice president for national productions and the U.S. programming representative for Pacific Rim, said that the member nations decide on projects by majority vote. A KCET-proposed project on 20th-century efforts toward world peace, including the League of Nations, the United Nations and country-to-country diplomacy, had been turned down, Galler disclosed.

Asked what the subject had to do with the Pacific Rim, she said with a laugh: "That was the problem. In the process we're learning that projects have to be more focused on the Pacific Rim."
