

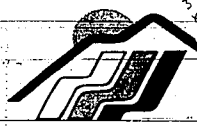

Here are hints how to beat the heat

TWIN FALLS — As the temperature goes up, so do utility bills as electric fans and air conditioners come on.

There are plenty of simple ways to beat the heat without flipping a switch, said Gloria "Harr," energy management representative for Idaho Power Co.:

- Close windows and drapes during the hot part of the day.
- Open doors and windows on opposite sides of the house during cool mornings and evenings to let the breeze blow through.
- Plant shade trees on the south and west sides of the house.
- Be sure your house has plenty of attic ventilation in addition to insulation. Daytime heat can be trapped by inadequately ventilated attics and released into the house during the evening.

'Hot' remains the word

TWIN FALLS — "Hot" has been this week's weather word in the Magic Valley, and serious relief may be several days away.

A high-pressure system brought high temperatures over the weekend, and the mercury has topped 90 degrees every day this week, except Wednesday, when the official high in Twin Falls was a nippy 89, according to the National Weather Service.

That high pressure is expected to move to the east just a bit this weekend, but not enough to cool temperatures significantly, said Bill Galkin of the National Weather Service office in Kimberly.

Temperatures should stay in the 90-degree range, but that shift will allow a southwesterly air flow to bring some tropical moisture in the form of late afternoon thundershowers, Galkin said.

The warm weather is not unusual for this time of year, he said.

July has been "about normal," so far, Galkin said, although average temperatures for July won't be figured until the end of the month. June was just below normal, with an average daily high temperature of 77.5 degrees, he said, noting that Twin Falls temperatures are typically about three degrees higher than at the weather service office.

Weather watchers will remember that last year's temperatures at this time were much cooler. The high for July 7, 1988, was 80 degrees; today's temperature is expected to reach 96.

That heat means farmers need more water, said Jack Eakin, general manager of the Twin Falls Canal Co.

The canal company is diverting water at peak capacity, unleashing 3,800 cubic feet of water per second from the Milner Dam, Eakin said.

That is about 200 cubic feet more than the company prefers to run, but the extra water is necessary to keep crops irrigated, he said.

Even now, the farmers at the end of the line in Castleford have trouble getting enough water, Eakin said.

"A summer rain shower would do us a tremendous amount of good," he said.

Summer rainfall is slightly behind schedule, with only half an inch of rain in June, Galkin said. The Magic Valley received 8.31 inches of rain — slightly above average — during the water year, which runs from Oct. 1 to June 30.

EPA sets 7-year phase-in for ban on asbestos use

WASHINGTON — The Environmental Protection Agency on Thursday ordered a ban on most remaining uses of cancer-causing asbestos, forbidding its use in hundreds of products from automobile brake parts to

water pipes. The prohibition will be phased in over the next seven years and apply only to new products. Asbestos-containing products already in use — and not affected by previous restrictions — are not included because in some cases replacement might be more hazardous than a gradual phase-out, officials said.

The action, however, will end the use of asbestos by 1996 in all but a handful of commercial products — guided missile liners, acetylene cylinders and some sealing tapes, for example — for which no adequate substitute has been found and where concerns about health risks are minimal, the agency said.

In the final phase of the ban, beginning in 1996, an estimated 95 percent of asbestos will be prohibited, said the agency.

"We're eliminating a known cancer-causing substance from the marketplace," declared EPA Administrator William Reilly at a news conference. He said that despite the known cancer threat from asbestos the mineral continues to be widely used.

The EPA action does not affect continuing efforts to rid buildings, including schools, of loosely formed asbestos insulation and spray-on asbestos, both of which have been banned from production since 1978. The EPA reiterated that removal of such asbestos should be carefully controlled to prevent even more serious exposure from airborne particles.

Under the new regulation, the use of asbestos in some products, including roofing material, pipe wrap and sheet products will be banned next year; its use by automakers in brake pads and linings will be prohibited beginning in 1993, and its use in auto replacement parts, cement water distribution pipes, roof-shingles and a variety of other uses will be ended in 1996.

Reilly said the timetable reflected the asbestos will be prohibited, said the agency.

Bush spurns latest offer for missile negotiations

WASHINGTON — President Bush spurned a call Thursday from Mikhail S. Gorbachev for swift negotiations on short-range nuclear missiles and challenged the Soviet leader to an new-to-withdraw Red Army troops from Poland.

Conceding Gorbachev had described the idea of a troop pullout as propaganda, Bush said: "I didn't know he rejected it because of a lack of enthusiasm, perhaps."

Bush said "it would be nice to aspire" to a situation where Gorbachev "wouldn't feel troops were necessary. I would have a feeling that at some point the Polish people might feel that way."

"He's just taken troops out of Hungary," Bush said. "Who would have said two years ago that that would happen? We salute that. We think that is good."

Bush used a nationally broadcast news conference to set the stage for a trip beginning Sunday to Poland and Hungary. He also will visit Paris for a seven-nation economic summit and make a one-day stop in the Netherlands, the first visit there by an American president.

Bush's news conference came on the same day that Gorbachev winding up a visit to France, offered to make additional and rapid cuts in Soviet nuclear forces if NATO agreed to hold negotiations on tactical, or short-range, nuclear weapons.

Bush noted that NATO agreed to begin negotiations on tactical weapons only after an East-West agreement had been reached.

Gorbachev issues challenge to NATO

STRASBOURG, France — Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev challenged NATO unity Thursday with a unilateral ultimatum to scrap more nuclear missiles.

He also made bold proposals laying a foundation for a "common European home" to end Cold War divisions.

In a wide-ranging address capping a three-day visit to France, Gorbachev also gave his clearest assurance the Soviet Union might someday be

Cholesterol hazard for millions

CHICAGO — An estimated 60 million Americans aged 20 and older have blood cholesterol levels high enough to be at risk for coronary heart disease and are in need of medical advice and intervention, a new study concludes.

"Even though we've made great strides in alerting the public to the dangers of cholesterol and heart disease, there's still too large a segment that is putting itself unnecessarily at risk," said Christopher Sempos, one of eight authors of the study published in today's Journal of the American Medical Association.

The government's National Center for Health Statistics lists coronary heart disease as the nation's leading killer, claiming 521,000 lives in 1986.

"What's especially disconcerting is that high cholesterol levels are often seen in association with other risk factors (for heart disease): hypertension, smoking, or being overweight," Sempos, a nutritionist and epidemiologist with the statistics center in Hyattsville, Md., said in a telephone interview.

"And for many people, most of the desired changes could be achieved through a change in routines like diet and exercise," Sempos said.

Researchers examined data from 11,864 adults between the ages of 20 and 74 who took part in the Second National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey from 1976 to 1980.

was 215 milligrams per deciliter. For men, it was 211.

For purposes of the study, participants with a blood-cholesterol level of about 240 or higher were considered to be in need of medical advice and intervention to lower it.

The same was true for any participant whose cholesterol level was 200 or higher in conjunction with at least two other risk factors for coronary heart disease: high blood pressure, diabetes, previous heart disease or stroke, excess weight, or smoking 10 cigarettes or more daily.

Researchers found a substantial increase with age in the proportion of people who are candidates for medical advice and intervention: For those 20 to 39 years of age, the rate was 20 percent; for those aged 40 to 59 years, it was almost 50 percent; and for those 60 to 74 years, it was almost 60 percent.

Fire crews fight 100-degree heat, spreading Utah blaze

Utah firefighters sweltered in 100-degree heat Thursday as they struggled to contain a 7,000-acre wildfire.

At the same time, forest officials in Wyoming trying to douse a 2,400-acre blaze worried about weekend weather forecasts calling for dry lightning.

In California, flames that scorched 1,100 acres of thick brush raged unbridled in rugged terrain near the Mexican border, but firefighters were gaining on the last in a series of wildfires in the southern part of the state.

Fires also charred land in Colorado, Georgia and Alaska.

Utah firefighters, reinforced by fresh crews, labored in the 100-degree heat to hand dig miles of fire lines on steep, tinder-dry terrain in an effort to

stop blazes that have blackened 11,000 acres of eastern forests.

Most of the fires still raged out of control, but a crew of 200 firefighters was slowly gaining the upper hand on the 7,000-acre Diamond Peak blaze, the largest uncontrolled fire in the lower 48 states on Thursday, said Mary Plumb, spokeswoman for the Bureau of Land Management's Moab district.

The Diamond Peak fire, located about 20 miles west of the Utah-Colorado border, was 40 percent contained Thursday.

Officials expect to fully contain the fire by Saturday, Plumb said.

In Bridger-Teton National Forest, Wyo., about 340 firefighters and a helicopter battled a fire that started Tuesday and grew from 2,200 acres to 2,400 acres Thursday in warm, breezy weather.

NASA probe discovers Neptune's jet stream bands

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — The Voyager 2 space probe has found two huge, dark bands forming a collar around Neptune's south pole which

may be 2,700-mile-wide belts of windblown clouds, scientists said Wednesday.

"They are somewhat like the jet

streams on Earth," said Andrew Ingersoll, a planetary scientist at the California Institute of Technology.

"But the real similarity is with

(bands in the atmospheres of Jupiter, Saturn and Uranus."

Unlike Earth's jet stream winds, which zigzag across various latitudes as they blow around the globe, the bands on Neptune, Jupiter, Saturn and Uranus are straight belts encircling those planets.

Such bands probably are "patterns brought about by circulating winds" in jet streams that flow parallel to the edges of each band, said Rich Terreille, an astronomer at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Jet Propulsion Laboratory.

Neptune's bands form a collar around the planet stretching from 40 degrees south latitude to 70 degrees south latitude, said Candice Hansen, a planetary scientist at the laboratory. That means each band is about 2,700 miles wide.

The dark bands were visible in what NASA called "the best color photo of Neptune taken so far by the Voyager 2 spacecraft." The probe made the photograph June 22 at a distance of 32.2 million miles from the planet, and NASA released an enhanced version of the color picture Wednesday.

The photograph also shows in greater detail a large dark spot — a cloud system bigger than the entire planet Mars — seen in earlier images of Neptune. Scientists said June 22 that they believe the 5,200-mile-wide spot is a storm similar to Jupiter's Great Red Spot or Earth's hurricanes.

Voyager is still too far from Neptune to determine if the bands contain dark high-altitude clouds or if they are broad ribbons of clear sky that allow Voyager to peer at dark clouds lower in Neptune's atmosphere, Terreille said.

The spacecraft was 45.5 million miles from Neptune on Wednesday, cruising at 42,203 mph as it headed

for its Aug. 24 close encounter with the solar system's fourth-largest planet. Voyager was 2.67 billion miles from Earth, but has traveled 4.38 billion miles along its curving path since it was launched 12 years ago.

Neptune's bands look like a single band on the Voyager photograph. But close examination indicates there are two bands separated by a thin boundary, Hansen said.

Scientists believe Earth's jet streams meander across latitudinal lines because of interference from continents and temperature differences in the oceans. It may be that the bands are straight on the giant outer planets because those worlds have extremely thick atmospheres with relatively simple wind circulation patterns, Hansen and Ingersoll said.

Studying Neptune's atmosphere will give scientists an understanding of the circulation pattern on a planet at one of the most remote fringes of our solar system," Terreille said, adding that knowledge of alien atmospheres "improves our ability to understand our own atmosphere."

Voyager 2 and its twin, Voyager 1, were launched from Cape Canaveral, Fla., in 1977.

They explored Jupiter in 1979. Voyager 1 flew past Saturn in 1980 and is headed toward interstellar space. Voyager 2 encountered Saturn in 1981, Uranus in 1986 and will fly about 3,000 miles above Neptune's north pole cloudtops at 9 p.m. PDT Aug. 24.

Five hours later it will encounter Neptune's backward-orbiting moon, Triton, at a distance of about 25,000 miles.

Neptune usually is the eighth planet from the sun, but because of Pluto's elongated orbit Neptune will be the ninth and outermost until 2007.

U.S. destroys last Pershing missiles while Soviets watch

KARNACK, Texas (AP) — With a Soviet inspection team looking on, the U.S. Army destroyed the last of its Pershing IA missiles Thursday, the first time an entire class of American nuclear weapons has been eliminated.

The ground shock at the Longhorn Army Ammunition Plant as white flames and smoke poured from the 16th Pershing IA to be destroyed under provisions of the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty.

The treaty, signed in 1987 by President Reagan and Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev, requires elimination of 859 U.S. intermediate-range and shorter range missiles and 1,752 similar Soviet missiles within three years.

The final 5,000-pound Pershing IA, strapped on its side to reinforced stands, was destroyed in two ignitions — one for each of two rocket motors.

The first burn lasted about 40 seconds and consumed one rocket stage. A half-minute later the second stage was fired for another 40 seconds. The more powerful of the two rocket motors carried enough propellant to hurl a 3,000-pound car about 150 miles in 45 seconds.

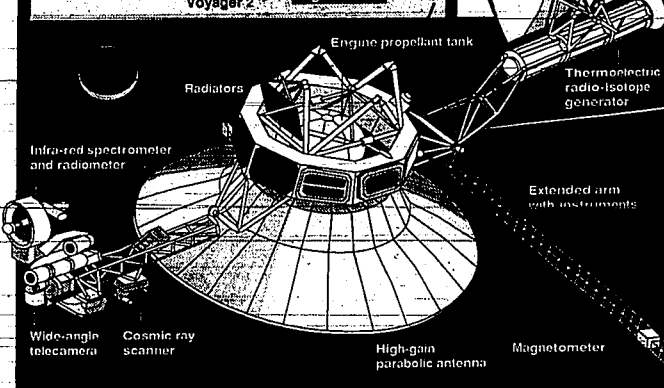
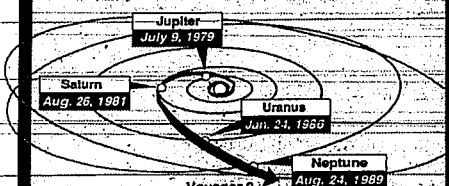
Some of the Soviet observers watched the operation from a concrete bunker near the firing site. Another contingent was about 1,000 feet away in a second observation area.

Gen. Maj. Vladimir Medvedev, director of the Soviet Nuclear Risk Reduction Center, watched the firing through binoculars. "This has been possible due to the new political thinking," he said. "This is a major step in the direction of peace."

Voyager 2 Visits Neptune

On August 24, the Voyager 2 space probe will make its fourth and final stop, twelve years and 4.4 billion miles after leaving Earth.

Storm drenches the East

WASHINGTON (AP) — The big wet currently being administered to the East is in the tradition of some serious drenchings of the past, when tropical storms got things started and then let nature take its soggy course.

"It's not a frequent occurrence, but it happens," said storm specialist Bob Case of the National Hurricane Center in Coral Gables, Fla., noting that a similar situation created devastating floods in West Virginia four years ago.

"This was not anything like a one-in-a-lifetime event, but it wasn't a garden variety storm either," added Scott Kroczyński of the National Weather Service's Office of Hydrology in Silver Spring, Md.

The flooding in the past day or two wasn't spread over a large area, but was severe in some localities, explained Kroczyński and co-worker Frank Richards.

Intense rain drenched a relatively narrow strip from suburban Washington to suburban New York on Wednesday, they noted, with 2 to 6 inches of rain in most areas but 10 inches or more in some spots, especially in northern Delaware, where at least two people drowned.

Many people are blaming tropical storm Allison for the intense rain, which disrupted train service between New York and Washington, swept away a camper in North Carolina and generally created miserable conditions along the East Coast.

Allison's remains, however, are in Alabama. That storm, despite the

intense rain it brought ashore in Texas and Louisiana more than a week ago, isn't a direct part of the East Coast problems, Case said.

But it is taking some of the blame, he noted. And that's appropriate, since it helped create the mess.

The last similar situation was ... Hurricane Juan in 1965, when severe flooding occurred in Virginia and West Virginia," Case said.

"Juan did the same thing. It did not cause the flooding, but (it) opened the way," he said. Before Juan, tropical storm Agnes in 1972 brought similar devastating rains, he explained.

Allison came ashore in Texas, worked northward to reach western Kentucky by last Monday, then drifted back to Alabama, where it is now a low pressure area. At the same time, a high pressure center is located off the East Coast.

Air around a low moves in a counter-clockwise direction. Around highs, it circulates clockwise.

When they meet, those circulations are like two meshed gears turning away, explained Case, with a low to the west turning counterclockwise and a high to the east turning clockwise.

That means the air flows combine between the two centers, pulling warm, moist air northward from the Gulf of Mexico to "inundate the United States east of the Appalachians," Case explained.

"The real culprit is this inundation of tropical, unstable air," he added.

As it moves north, the warm, wet air rises, pushed up by the land.

NTSB pursues safety measures for cruise ships

WASHINGTON (AP) — The National Transportation Safety Board voted Thursday to seek safety regulation of foreign-registered cruise ships that carry thousands of American passengers a day from U.S. ports.

The recommendation came after the board ruled 4-0 that lack of maintenance, lack of fire-fighting procedures and poor crew training caused a nearly catastrophic 1988 fire aboard a Bahamian vessel carrying 700 people.

The board said the failure of a fire-suppression system and the inability of crewmembers, who spoke a variety of languages, to communicate with each other and with passengers heightened the emergency aboard the Scandinavian Star.

"It was only sheer luck" that no injuries or deaths occurred aboard the 10,000-ton vessel owned by Sea Escape of Miami, said the safety board chairman, James L. Kolstad. The fire broke out while the ship was en route to St. Petersburg, Fla., after a two-day Gulf of Mexico cruise.

"This is an invitation to disaster," said Kolstad, referring to an industry that operates 81 large passenger ships from U.S. ports but without being required to meet any U.S. safety standards. The ships are registered in several countries.

Commercialism has already trashed our national symbols

The protesting Chinese students who created a "Goddess of Liberty" modeled after our own Lady with the Lamp paid a dear price for their actions.

I was thinking of their courage recently while regarding a poster-sized advertisement for a brand of yogurt. The ad featured Lady Liberty holding up a cup of yogurt instead of a lamp.

Is this what those Chinese students are dying for? For a free market in which a symbol of freedom is turned into a yogurt ad?

The Statue of Liberty, which also plays a role as a "slimebuster" in the latest "Ghostbusters" saga, is just one of various American symbols that are routinely used as sales gimmicks.

Which is why I am rather surprised at the outrage over the U.S. Supreme Court's decision that burning an American flag is a legitimate exercise of free speech.

constitutional amendment against flag burning.

I'm amused at this reaction. The American flag, and various other symbols of America, have been shamelessly exploited in commercial advertisements for years. This trivializes and devalues the value of these symbols, just as a flag burning insults the national honor.

When a flag is burned by a far-left dissident like Gregory L. Johnson at the 1984 Republican National Convention in Dallas, the action acknowledges the flag as a powerful symbol, a sign of America and what it represents.

That yogurt advertisement, by contrast, trivializes the Statue of Liberty; it equates patriotism with eating the right kind of yogurt.

Advertisements that incorporate American flags, and I know you see them all the time, decrease the flag's value far more than an isolated act of flag burning. The companies are trying to piggyback on the flag's prestige, but the prestige of a flag is

diminished by such commercialism. It is one of the great strengths of this country that we allow for a great range of expression. And yes, some of these expressions offend some people. Certainly burning a flag is an action designed to provoke anger as much as to win support.

Come to think of it, that could be what the Chinese students were doing when they built their Goddess of Liberty. To American viewers, the statue was noble, exciting and a sign of the students' commitment to

democracy. To Chinese hard-liners it was outrageous, insulting and convincing evidence that these students were counter-revolutionaries. To the Chinese establishment, building a symbol of the decadent West was equivalent to flag burning — in this case, students-house-to-house.

The students paid for this gaudiness, or belligerence, with their lives. By contrast, in the United States, even revolutionary communists like Johnson can have their day in court.

The Supreme Court's flag-burning decision is not an indication of the decaying fiber of this nation; it is an affirmation of our basic strength — our commitment to free speech. Flag burning is an extreme expression, true. But sometimes extreme situations demand this kind of strong protest.

What disturbs me more than the flag-burning case is the seemingly shameless use of patriotic symbols by private businesses trying to

slather some patriotic prestige on their product.

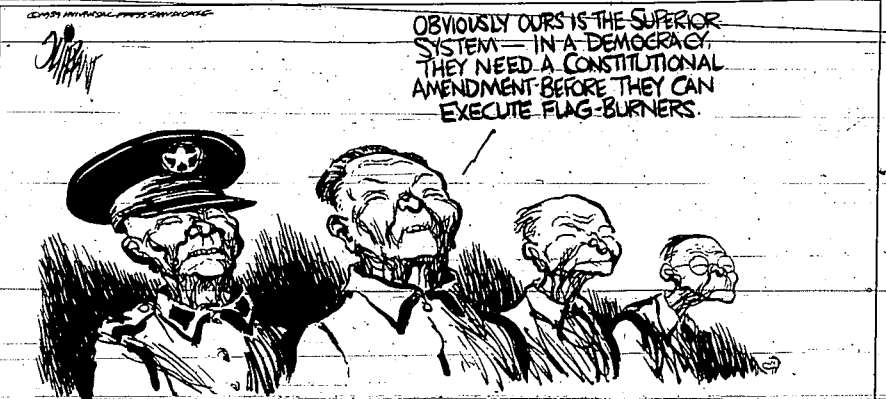
I don't propose that we attempt to legislate this away. But how seriously will our country's children take the symbols of our country when such symbols are associated with sales days, not free speech?

This is a more important issue than a constitutional amendment on flag burning.

Court's decision will be a disaster as abortion policy

As legal doctrine, the Supreme Court's blockbuster decision in Webster vs. Reproductive Health Services is a disappointment.

It tells Americans little that we did not already know and provides only the dimmest guidance for future litigation. As abortion policy, the decision is a disaster.

In the aftermath of Webster, seven of the nine justices have taken unequivocal stands on Roe vs. Wade, the 1973 decision that first recognized the constitutional right to an abortion. Four (William J. Brennan Jr., Thurgood Marshall, Harry A. Blackmun and John Paul Stevens) stand solidly behind Roe; Three (William H. Rehnquist, Byron R. White and Antonin Scalia) are explicitly prepared to overrule.

The future therefore lies with Justices Anthony M. Kennedy and Sandra Day O'Connor. In Webster, Kennedy joined with Rehnquist and White in an opinion that refused to decide whether Roe should be explicitly overruled, but whose hostility to any constitutionally protected right to an abortion was undisguised. It is not clear whether that means that Kennedy is

unprepared to overrule Roe, or that he is only biding his time before showing his hand. The smart money is on the latter interpretation.

O'Connor is therefore once again uncomfortably at center stage. As in past decisions, she refused to say whether she regards Roe as sound precedent. She needs to decide that question, she said, because her previous position — that regulation of abortion is not unconstitutional unless it unduly burdens the right to seek an abortion — would permit the Missouri law at issue in Webster to stand.

The court's refusal to reach the question of Roe's continued validity irritated Scalia. He charged that the "indecisive" decision "preserves a choice that is evident to anyone who can read and count." Scalia is clearly right in that. The outcome in Webster is an open invitation to state and local governments to test the limits of the court's resolve. If O'Connor and Kennedy in fact believe that Roe should be overturned, there

is little to justify the agonizing uncertainty, the untold hours of unnecessary effort and litigation, the mountains of wasted legal fees and judicial time that Webster is almost certain to produce.

If O'Connor and Kennedy are postponing the destruction of Roe in the hope that the coup-de-grace will seem less political if sufficiently delayed, they are almost certainly incorrect. As frustration and anxiety grow, as legislative options for the regulation of abortion increase but remain trapped in the courts, the whole question will become more, rather than less, politicized. Whenever and however Roe is destroyed, the court will have hell to pay.

If there are in fact five justices who believe that the whole question of abortion should be handed back to the states for legislative resolution, then it would be best for the court and the country to have done with it cleanly and decisively. In the meantime, however, the definitive vote in evaluating the constitutionality of abortion regulation is likely to be O'Connor's, which means that everything depends on which regulations she will find to be "unduly

burdensome." Unfortunately, her opinion casts little if any illumination on that question.

There were two salient issues. The first concerned a Missouri statute banning the utilization of any public facility for abortions, not necessary to save the life of the mother. Ten years ago the court ruled that state governments could withhold public support for abortions. The Missouri law was different because its broad definition of "public facility" suggested that the state was attempting to reach out and use public property as leverage to control private conduct.

O'Connor, however, refused to decide the question of the reach of Missouri law, stating that the constitutionality of the application of the law to private hospitals leasing state-owned land "need not be decided here." She pursued a similar strategy of deflection with regard to the second major issue — a poorly drafted Missouri statute that appeared to require that physicians conduct expensive and possibly dangerous tests whenever performing abortions at 20 weeks or later. O'Connor ducked the issue by

reinterpreting the statute to require only safe and easily administered medical tests that "would only marginally, if at all, increase the cost of an abortion."

At every level, then, Webster raises more questions than it answers. This result could be disastrous for the pro-choice movement. In the past decade the movement has been losing its political luster by the stream-

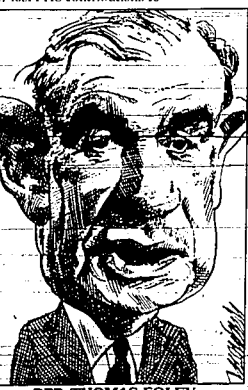
promise of judicial protection. Had the court swept Roe cleanly off the books, the movement might have been galvanized into action. But the legal ambiguities of Webster appear to offer yet another siren call, one the movement would be well-advised to ignore. In the future, the real game will be played in state legislatures, not federal courts. What remains to be seen is whether the pro-choice movement can effectively mobilize in the absence of clear and decisively negative court rulings that would enable states seriously to constrict the access to abortion of middle-class women.

Congress really needs new blood, less establishment bias

President Bush, who used to have a political action committee of his own, now says that PACs "tend to denigrate the political debate."

So he has proposed banning corporate, trade group and union PACs. To make up for lost PAC contributions to

Congress by the political culture inside the Beltway. After a year or two on Capitol Hill, they become creatures of Washington, no longer representing their states and districts in the nation's capital, but acting as representatives of Washington to the folks back home.

A decade or two ago, senators and representatives who took on Washington airs would be defeated. But not now. Incumbents have stacked the deck so heavily in their own favor that 90 percent of them win re-election. This is the new corrupt, anti-democratic, vote-buying system. Eliminating PACs is part of the cure, but only a small part. PAC money doesn't really make Senate and House members change their votes. When he was chairman of the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee, then-Rep. Tony Coelho of California realized that liberal Democrats could take money from business PACs, vote however they wished and then ask for more PAC contributions. The PACs grumbled but complied, figuring they at least got access to the members.

The thing to remember about PACs is that they are concentrated in Washington. Virtually every night, members of Congress hold political receptions in Washington to which PAC managers stream with their checks. This is an easy way for incumbents to raise money. It beats going back to their states or districts to drum up campaign funds. And as senators and representatives increasingly rely on PACs, they become Washingtonized. Letting national parties funnel them more money won't help. Parties can already give House candidates \$10,000 in cash and \$17,980 in "in-kind" expenses. Raising that limit — House

Republicans want to double it and Bush's plan would increase it even more — means they'd get more money from Washington. As a result, they'd have less incentive to raise funds from their constituents.

Public financing isn't the answer either. It tilts campaigns heavily in favor of incumbents. They get the advantage of free mailings to their constituents and free publicity in the media as officeholders. To combat this, challengers have the option of raising large amounts of money for TV ads to publicize their campaigns. If they raise enough, they may even outpace their opponents. Public financing would cut off that option, limiting challengers to no more spending than incumbents.

As it stands now, PACs make outspending practically impossible, since three-quarters of PAC money goes to incumbents. House Speaker Thomas Foley got nearly \$600,000 from PACs for his 1988 re-election. What is needed to dislodge the permanent political class on Capitol Hill are sweeping reforms, not tepid measures like public financing. There are ways for incumbents to run for re-election without tapping PACs, the parties, or fat cats, and for challengers to get a fair shot against incumbents without unbundled fundraising.

In most Senate and many House races, the bulk of campaign spending is for one thing: air time for television ads. Since TV stations are a public trust, they should be compelled to provide free air time for congressional candidates, some in prime viewing hours. The candidates, both incumbents and challengers, could divide it up as they wish, some for 30-second spots, some for five-minute speeches, for example. In some races, especially in urban areas, House candidates don't use TV

because it's not cost-effective. It doesn't make sense for Rep. Henry Waxman of Los Angeles to buy time on television when his constituents comprise only about 5 percent of the viewing audience.

Waxman relies on direct mail, paid and franked. The franking privilege lets a member of Congress send newsletters, announcements and speeches to constituents with no postage. To match this advantage, challengers should be given the same franking privilege in districts where that's appropriate.

With PACs gone, the public would still deserve assurance that its senators and representatives aren't beholden to Washington interests. Honorary for speeches — or for just showing up at some corporate or trade association meetings should be eliminated. Coelho resigned from Congress recently after the questionable arrangements under which he borrowed \$100,000 for a junk bond were disclosed. He shouldn't have been personally involved in the transaction, which grew out of connections he'd made while raising campaign money. As luck would have it, there's a foolproof way of avoiding incidents like this. Upon election to Congress, a new member should be required to put his finances in a truly blind trust.

Thomas Jefferson was on to something when he said America needed a revolution every 20 years. Washington gets a bit of one at least every eight years when a new president is installed, but Congress gets off the hook entirely. Members get subcommittee and committee chairmanships, build alliances with the bureaucracy and tighten ties with interest groups in Washington. The result is awful. Every social program, no matter how wasteful, stays in operation. Nearly every Pentagon weapons system that gets under way continues to be funded, despite attempts

Doolittle among recipients of medal

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush Thursday awarded the nation's highest civilian award, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, to Gen. James H. Doolittle, public servant C. Douglas Dillon and George Kennan, former Sen. Margaret Chase Smith and comedian Lucille Ball.

Miss Ball's award was accepted posthumously by her husband, Gary Morton. Bush praised the five as American heroes.

"You have left an indelible mark as you have enriched this nation, and America is grateful," he said.

Doolittle, 92, the aviation pioneer and retired Air Force general who made history by leading the first U.S. air strike on Japan following the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, was described by the president as "the master of the calculated risk" and a "trailblazer in modern aviation." In the 1960s he was an executive in the private aerospace industry.

Bush said Kennan, 85, was "truly a visionary" on U.S. Soviet relations. In addition to writing extensively on that subject, he served in the State Department as head of the policy planning staff and as counsel, and later was ambassador to the Soviet Union from 1962 to 1963 and ambassador to Yugoslavia in the early 1980s.

Mrs. Smith, 91, the former Republican senator and congresswoman from Maine, gained fame for her speech denouncing the tactics of 1950s anti-communist crusader Sen. Joseph McCarthy of Wisconsin. She served in Congress under six presidents, beginning with Franklin Roosevelt in 1940.

Dillon, 79, former ambassador to France and undersecretary of state in the 1950s and Treasury secretary from 1961 to 1966, was praised by Bush for his contributions to Latin America and Western Europe policy as well as tax policy.

Kemp continues to slash wasteful HUD programs

WASHINGTON (AP) — Housing Secretary Jack Kemp on Thursday halted an elderly-housing program that has lost more than \$119 million on projects that government analysts say were not necessary or were too large.

The announcement marked the third time in recent weeks that Kemp has suspended or canceled Department of Housing and Urban Development programs because of suspected mismanagement and

abuse during President Reagan's eight years in office.

Kemp said mortgage defaults under the five-year-old elderly housing program totaled \$250 million so far, and he said it had too often served well-to-do elderly instead of the low- to moderate-income population it was created to serve. The \$119 million represents HUD's direct loss to date in payments to private lenders who provided financing for the projects in return

for government backing of the loans. As an example, Kemp cited a Palm Beach, Fla., development he said charged \$2,100 a month rent for two-bedroom apartments. The audit of Midwestern projects approved under the program found many were less than half occupied.

Overall, 30 percent of all the elderly housing projects in which HUD insured the mortgages are in default, as are 12 percent of similar projects in which HUD is a co-insurer of the financing and liable for 80 percent of the cost of any default.

Kemp has been trying to get to handle on the agency's troubles at a

time when Congress also is investigating allegations of fraud, mismanagement and influence-peddling at HUD during the Reagan administration.

Kemp made his announcement as congressional investigators said they would summon former HUD Secretary Samuel Pierce to testify about allegations he personally ordered the agency to finance an unrelated project involving a longtime friend.

In earlier testimony, Pierce denied any direct role in such decisions. But published reports have quoted a former HUD official as saying Pierce directed her to

approve the project.

Kemp, in announcing he was halting new and pending applications for the Retirement Service Center program, said he planned to revise the program after its guidelines were rewritten to guarantee improved project selection and guaranteed targeting to low-income elderly.

The program was designed to provide housing to people over age 70 who can live on their own and afford market rents. The centers do not provide medical care but do offer such services as central dining and recreation.

U.S. urges Palestinians to help Israel election

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Bush administration urged Palestinian Arabs on Thursday to participate in an Israeli election plan despite tough conditions set by Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir.

But the Palestine Liberation Organization, which claims to speak for the 1.4 million who live on the West Bank and in Gaza, said Shamir's terms slammed the door on the peace process.

"These efforts now face total failure," PLO spokesman Ahmed Abdul-Radman said at PLO headquarters in Tunis.

The Bush administration, by contrast, reiterated its support for the election proposal and reacted calmly to the terms Shamir approved Wednesday in Tel Aviv at the urging of harder-line leaders of the Likud political coalition.

State Department spokesman Richard Boucher called on Palestinians to accept the proposal and to open talks with Israel "to flesh out the details of the initiative and to make elections and negotiations work."

At the same time, however, the U.S. official took an indirect slap at the hard line adopted by Shamir at the Likud party convention in Tel Aviv.

Partisan declarations, particularly if they appear to be more restrictive or impose conditions that do not advance the process, Boucher said.

The U.S. spokesman stressed that the plan for elections among Palestinian Arabs on the West Bank and in Gaza had the endorsement of the Israeli Cabinet as well as the Bush administration. Boucher said it

provides "the most realistic way to advance the peace process."

The election would choose Palestinian leaders to negotiate temporary, local self-rule with Israel. After five years, Israeli, Palestinians, Egypt and Jordan would work out an overall settlement.

The conditions set by Shamir did not represent any change in the Israeli leader's position.

Executive gets probation for Iran-Contra doings

WASHINGTON (AP) — A public relations executive who testified against Oliver L. North was placed on probation Thursday for allegedly using a tax-exempt foundation to raise donations for the Nicaraguan rebels.

Richard R. Miller was sentenced on his 1987 guilty plea to conspiracy to defraud the Treasury by using a tax-exempt foundation to raise \$3.2 million for the non-deductible purpose of buying armaments for the Contras.

U.S. District Judge Stanley S. Harris placed Miller on two years' probation and ordered him to perform 120 hours of community service.

Harris, noting that Miller had already suffered many adversities as a result of his guilty plea, said "I need not impose more for justice to be served."

Miller, who cooperated with independent counsel Lawrence E. Walsh's investigation of the Iran-Contra affair, could have been sentenced up to five years in prison and fined up to \$20,000.

Prosecutors made no sentencing recommendation, but noted in court pleadings that Miller had cooperated with their investigation of the private foundation that raised some \$10 million for the Contras when U.S. military aid was banned by Congress.

China steps up crackdown on intellectuals, Zhao's advisers

BEIJING (AP) — China published a report Thursday condemning prominent intellectuals who spoke out on political and economic issues in recent months.

The report indicated the government was intensifying its five-week-old crackdown on dissent.

The report also stepped up criticism of ousted Communist Party leader Zhao Ziyang and accused his aides and advisers of collaborating with student leaders in efforts to overthrow the government.

Beijing Mayor Chen Xitong read the report June 30 to the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress, which meets between annual sessions of the full congress. It was made public Thursday after the congress approved it.

When party officials urged Zhao to call a meeting in April to discuss a growing student movement, Zhao "went golfing as if nothing had happened," the report said. Later he encouraged frank press reports of the subsequent protests, it said.

The government report stopped just short of accusing Zhao of taking part in the alleged anti-government conspiracy by those under him.

It singled out not just people who took part in the protests but intellectuals, who it said created a climate that encouraged the protests.

Some of the intellectuals Chen named are known to have escaped China or gone underground in the last month, while others have been arrested. By naming individuals and describing their activities in detail, the report appeared to signal a widening purge of intellectuals.

Although the student protests began in April, intellectuals had become increasingly outspoken on political, cultural and economic issues since late last year as problems in China's 10-year-old

economic reform program became evident.

Thinkers and writers held forums and published unofficial magazines to criticize government policy, and signed petitions for an amnesty for political prisoners. The report said this "prepared for the turmoil that ensued."

Chen singled out more than a dozen people, including leading dissident Fang Lizhi, who has taken refuge in the U.S. Embassy, and political theorists Yan Jiaqi and Su Shaozhi, who have fled to the West.

A publishing company official said authorities have banned publication of works by Fang and people accused of "ideological mistakes."

Also Thursday, the National People's Congress appointed a new ambassador to the United States in a climate of worsening relations between the two countries. Zhu Qizhen, who had been vice foreign minister and who speaks fluent English, was named to replace Han Xu, who held the post for four years. State TV said Han's term was up.

He was recalled to Beijing last week along with China's other ambassadors for what the Foreign Ministry called a regular meeting.

Western diplomats said it was the first such general recall in decades.

Jiang Zemin, who replaced Zhao as party chief, told a visiting Indian delegation that China would not change its policies in response to foreign economic sanctions. It was his first meeting with a foreign visitor since taking office June 24.

Jiang did not single out the United States, which has halted military sales and high-level contacts to protest China's June 3-4 army attack on the protesters.

The congress Standing Committee, however, passed a resolution expressing "strong indignation" over the U.S. action.

Also Thursday, the Foreign Ministry sharply rejected a U.S. Embassy protest over an army attack on foreign diplomatic housing.

The embassy had charged that the army made a premeditated attack

on targeted apartments, including those of American diplomats, when it fired on the housing complex last month. The official Xinhua News Agency said Vice Foreign Minister Liu Huaqiu gave U.S. Ambassador James Lilloy a note rejecting the accusation as "groundless and irresponsible."

Leading newspapers joined the offensive, with commentaries blasting alleged U.S. efforts to undermine socialist countries. One commentary by the editor of a leading party magazine, Seek Truth, said in an analysis that conflict is inevitable between the socialist and capitalist systems.

The Standing Committee approved two Cabinet changes. Labor Minister Luo Gan was replaced with a former public security minister, Ruan Chongwu, and Chemical Industry Minister Qin Zhongda was replaced with Gu Xiulian, who until recently was governor of Jiangsu province.

It was not clear if the changes were linked to the party's political shakeup.

Scientists applaud warhead detection

MOSCOW (AP) — American scientists proclaimed success Thursday in a pioneering experiment to detect the presence of a nuclear warhead aboard a Soviet warship in the Black Sea.

The success of the experiment, if confirmed by other scientists, could bolster Soviet-President Mikhail S. Gorbachev's argument that it is possible to verify the presence of nuclear weapons aboard ships and submarines.

"It was very successful," said Tom Cochran, an American physicist with the Natural Resource Defense Council, a liberal Washington group that organized the experiment with the Soviet state Academy of Sciences.

But it remains possible for either side to hide weapons or shield them against detection by the type of devices used Wednesday, Cochran said.

Washington has balked at Soviet demands that the proposed Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty, which would

cut superpower atomic arsenals by 30 percent to 50 percent, include a curb on nuclear-tipped cruise missiles aboard submarines.

U.S. Navy officers say they will not allow Soviets aboard American submarines to conduct the intrusive inspections needed to determine whether a cruise missile is carrying a conventional or nuclear warhead.

Soviet technology lags far behind American in the sophisticated missiles, which can be launched close to an enemy's shore, can fly at altitudes too low for radar detection and deliver a nuclear punch without warning against key coastal areas.

In Wednesday's Black Sea experiment, Soviet government and private American scientists used a variety of radiation detection devices to measure the emission of neutrons and gamma rays from a nuclear warhead on an SS-N-12 submarine cruise missile aboard the Soviet missile cruiser Slava.

West Germans snuff bomb attack plans

BONN, West Germany (AP) — Authorities arrested a Lebanese Shiite Moslem student after raiding his apartment in West Germany and finding evidence he was plotting bomb attacks on U.S. and Israeli targets, officials said Thursday.

Investigators uncovered the alleged plans just in time, before any attacks could be carried out, said investigator Erwin Hoels of the Bavarian Criminal Office in Munich,

where some of the alleged bombings were to occur.

The 21-year-old student, who was arrested in Darmstadt June 22 and allegedly hired by Arab terrorists in Lebanon, may have accomplices still loose in West Germany, authorities said.

No explosives were found in the raid on the student's apartment, but Hoels said investigators did discover Arab-language notes giving "clear

indications of imminent attacks" using explosives.

Hoels said authorities delayed announcing the June 22 arrest and raid because of fears the investigation could be jeopardized. Officials made the case public after the Munich-based Sueddeutsche Zeitung revealed the inquiry in its Thursday editions.

Hoels identified the suspect only as Bassam M., a physics student.

Soviets try to explain pilotless plane

MOSCOW (AP) — A Soviet officer said Thursday radar operators handling many military flights failed to notice the pilotless MiG-23 fighter sailing halfway across Europe before it crashed in Belgium.

"To control every plane when there are so many is not economical or practical," said air force Lt. Col. Anatoly S. Balikin, speaking at a news conference.

The pilot of the MiG, Col. Nikolai Skurigin, also appeared before reporters and apologized profusely to the family of the man killed Tuesday when the jet struck a house in Wevelgem, Belgium, near the French border.

Skurigin had ejected in Poland after reporting his aircraft smoking and heading into the Baltic Sea. Soviet helicopters were still searching in that area when they were surprised by Western reports that the jet had crashed in Belgium, 650 miles away, said Gen. Yevgeny Shaposhnikov, deputy commander-in-chief of the Soviet air force.

The plane flew over Poland, East Germany, West Germany, the Netherlands and Belgium before running out of fuel and crashing into a house near the Belgium-France border, killing a 18-year-old man.

The West European countries protested the

incident to the Soviet Union for failing to inform them about the wayward plane.

The Soviet government has offered to pay compensation to the victim's family in an apparently unprecedented gesture by the Kremlin, but has not yet spelled out details of the payment.

At least one East-bloc radar facility picked up an unidentified plane crossing the border into the West, Balikin said, but authorities believed the report erroneous because they counted their planes and found none missing.

"This all took place under difficult conditions," Balikin said. "Over the city of Kolobrzeg, there were training flights of East German, Soviet and Polish planes."

There were also training flights over East Germany, he said. "The flight paths were parallel or very close to the flight paths of this flight or in the opposite direction," he added.

A U.S. official who declined to be further identified said the Soviet explanation "calls into question their command and control of their own aircraft. It's like saying they had an accident because there was a lot of traffic."

Palestinian causes bus crash

ABU GHOSH, Israel (AP) — A Palestinian shouting "God is great!" grabbed the steering wheel of an Israeli bus Thursday and veered it into a 200-foot ravine where it exploded in flames, killing 14 people, police said. Twenty-seven people were injured. Helicopters brought up the dead and injured victims from the gutted chassis of the bus, which lay in a circle of burned grass below the Tel Aviv-Jerusalem highway, eight miles west of Jerusalem. Also hauled up were bags of victims' belongings.

including glasses, shoes, purses and wallets, and a Book of Psalms. "I can't describe it ... You see something black that just a few minutes ago was a human being," said Rami Yaffe, head of the fire brigade that helped in rescue operations. U.S. officials said seven of the injured were Americans, including a woman who was visiting Israel to watch her daughter compete in the Maccabiah Games for Jewish athletes. Another of the injured was identified as Canadian. The injured

were not identified. Officials also said two people were unaccounted for. Police arrested an Arab bus passenger from the occupied territories. "We know for certain that this man is the attacker," said Police Commissioner David Krauss. "Maybe he was the one who also planned it. Inside the bus, he acted alone." Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir said on "army radio" that the crash was "a shocking disaster, the fruit of a disgusting mind."

Hungarian leader Kadar dies

BUDAPEST, Hungary (AP) — Janos Kadar, Hungary's leader from the repression of 1956 through the liberalized "goulash communism" of the 1970s until his removal last year as a relic of the rigid past, died Thursday at age 77. "The era Kadar represented we were already burying while he was still alive," a commentator said on state radio. "That era began in October, 1956, when Kadar took over the Communist Party and summoned Soviet tanks to crush the anti-Stalinist uprising led by Premier Imre Nagy.

Nagy was executed in 1958. Liberal new Hungarian leaders reburied him with honors this spring, and a few hours after Kadar's death the Supreme Court exonerated Nagy of all charges, completing his rehabilitation. A statement carried by the official news agency MTL announced "with deep shock and profound sorrow" that Kadar had died Thursday "after a prolonged, serious illness." He was hospitalized Monday with pneumonia and breathing and circulatory problems. Kadar was reported gravely ill in

April and in May lost his two remaining posts: honorary party chairman and member of the Central Committee, which wrote him a letter criticizing "erroneous decisions" during his long rule. He responded in a letter, his last public statement, that he always acted in Hungary's best interests of his country but had made "mistakes." A statement from the party leadership Thursday emphasized both Kadar's success with cautious reform and the later years characterized by economic stagnation and discontent over stalled reforms.

AIDS cases continue to climb

GENEVA (AP) — The number of cases of AIDS reported to the World Health Organization totaled 167,373 by July 1, marking an increase by more than 10,000 from the previous month, according to WHO statistics released Thursday. The WHO estimates the actual number is more than twice as high and at least 1 million new cases are expected worldwide by 1993. Updates from Kenya, more than doubling the previous figure, and from the United States made up most of the newly reported cases registered by the WHO as of July 1. So far, 149 countries or territories have reported at least one case. Twenty-eight countries, mainly in Asia, advised the WHO they had no cases. Kenya reported 5,949 cases by March 31, or 3,217 more than the previous total dated June 30, 1988, while the United States listed 95,561 cases, an increase by 2,842 between May 9 and May 31. Updates from Burkina Faso, Burundi, and Zambia also contributed to the overall rise in reported AIDS cases in Africa by more than 5,000 to 29,906. Among the world's more populous countries, Uganda has the highest AIDS rate with 26.3 cases per 100,000 inhabitants. It has the second-highest total with 6,772 cases listed in January. Brazil, with 6,421 cases, has a rate of 1.9; France has a rate of 4.2 and the fourth-highest total worldwide, 6,409. European updates during June included Italy, from 3,494 to 3,773 and West Germany, from 3,068 to 3,324. Acquired immune deficiency syndrome is caused by a virus that damages the body's immune system, leaving victims susceptible to infections.

Lost hydrogen bomb leaves no radioactivity

TOKYO (AP) — No abnormalities have been found in samples of fish and seaweed taken from the area where a hydrogen bomb fell off a U.S. aircraft carrier 24 years ago, the Science and Technology Agency said Thursday. The findings were contained in a preliminary report. Agency official Kimihiko Oda said the agency still was analyzing water samples taken from the deep sea, and a final report would be available by the end of July. He said samples were taken in the fishing grounds nearest to the area where an A-4 Skyhawk plane carrying a one-megaton H-bomb accidentally rolled off the carrier *Intrepid* on Dec. 8, 1966. The bomb fell into the sea about 80 miles from a small island off Okinawa, in southern Japan. Japan did not become aware of the accident until May, when it began its tests. The agency also analyzed data

from annual surveys taken in many places in Japan and offshore for the past 21 years to check on radioactive fallout from nuclear tests by China, the Soviet Union, the United States and France, Oda said, and no abnormalities were found. "Still to be analyzed are water samples collected from a depth of 14,850 feet by a vessel of the Maritime Safety Agency, Japan's coast guard. Oda said no samples were taken from the 15,840-foot-deep seabed where the bomb sank because the survey's aim was to find whether the accident affected Japan's people and the marine environment. "Last month, William Arkin of the Washington-based Institute for Policy Studies, which released declassified U.S. Navy documents on the accident, said there was little danger the bomb would detonate, although the 33 pounds of plutonium it contained could threaten the environment as it deteriorates.

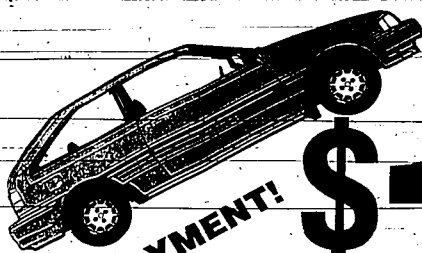

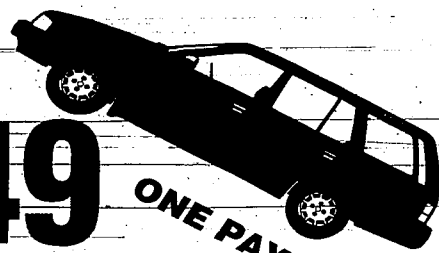

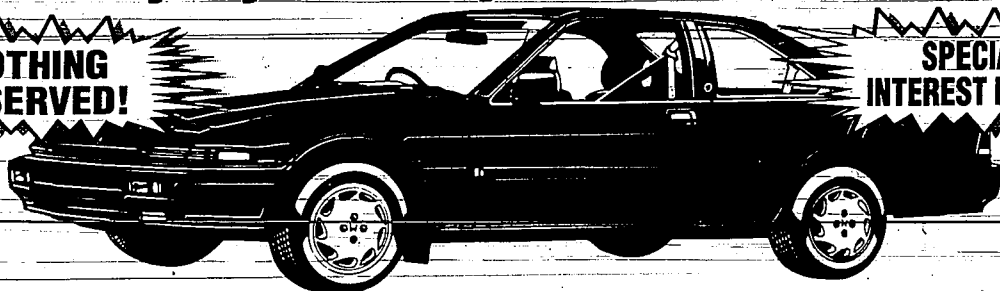

Scarlet fever bacteria may be spreading

By The Times-News and The Associated Press

BOISE — A Boise physician has discovered that a resurgence of scarlet fever bacteria could be afflicting young adults in the West and possibly elsewhere.

Dr. Dennis L. Stevens, chief author of an article detailing the bacteria's threat in Thursday's issue of the "New England Journal of Medicine," discovered 20 cases, including six deaths, in Idaho, Montana, Utah and Nevada in the last five years.

The scope of the newly identified outbreak is unclear. However, doctors said it could be part of the apparent reappearance of potent strains of streptococcal bacteria.

"It's a bigger problem than 20 patients, believe me," said Stevens, an infectious disease specialist for the Veterans Administration Medical Center

in Boise.

Only six of those patients were from Idaho, with most coming from Boise, Pocatello and Idaho Falls, said Cheryl Becker, infectious diseases expert for the South Central District Health Department.

This "extremely virulent" strain of streptococcus responds to regular antibiotics, Becker said. Complications arise because the symptoms often escalate before victims are treated, she said. Throats of Idaho's six patients died.

The problem is not new to health officials, Becker said. Information concerning the bacterial strain was on her desk last year, but it has taken several months for articles to be published in medical journals, she said.

A few Twin Falls-area physicians had noted unrelated cases of scarlet fever during the winter, but none was severe enough to cause public

concern, she said.

When the bug does strike, it can have dire consequences.

Stevens said the bacteria has struck victims under seemingly innocuous circumstances and rapidly thrust them into life-threatening situations. One man, for example, developed the infection from a blood blister in his thumb.

In Stevens' first case, in 1984, the victim had gone to the hospital with a mild fever. After 10 hours, he went into shock and died eight hours later.

"I was amazed at the rapidity with which this occurred," he said. "I saw another case a year later. I started talking to colleagues. They told me of similar cases."

Medical experts blame the outbreak on group A streptococcal bacteria that make a toxin which causes scarlet fever. Other group A streptococci do not make this poison cause sore throats as

140 city employees would support Teamsters

POCATELLO (AP) — About 140 of the city's 350 full-time employees have signed petitions indicating they support affiliation with the Teamsters, even though the city may not recognize the labor union.

"Employees are upset about wage disparities and are tired of being treated as second-class citizens by the administration," John Seaton, business representative for Teamsters Local 963, said Thursday.

"They're not to blame for that. I would say this is definitely more than just a passing interest. They're ready to organize."

On Wednesday, employees from the city's water, street, and parks departments met with Teamster representatives to go over plans to gather signatures on a petition that will be presented to the city council.

Seaton estimates 170 employees will have signed the petition by next week, or about 90 percent of the workers eligible for union representation. Superintendents, supervisors and employees in the police department are ineligible.

"In a couple of weeks I think we'll be in a position to go to Mayor Dick Finlayson and the council to request either an election or official recognition as the employees' representative," Seaton said.

Idaho law requires municipal governments to bargain with firefighter representatives. Other unions representing public employees bargain only if local governments recognize the union representation.

In order to call a special election, Seaton said, a minimum of 60 percent of the employees must sign a petition. He said the Teamsters already have about 90 percent of the city's blue-collar workers' signed.

"I've never had that large a bunch

express interest in union representation in all the years I've been organizing," he said. "I think that should be telling administration officials something about employee attitudes."

Teamsters representatives began pushing the movement about three weeks ago after employees began complaining about a proposed 25-percent raise in pay for the mayor's position. Employees will receive a 3-percent increase this year.

Paul DeLong, the city's personnel director, said the city has not taken an official position on the issue.

"We haven't been approached by the Teamsters about any of this and at this point, we're more concerned with trying to get several budget items out of the way," he said.

Meanwhile, Pocatello firefighters, who are represented by the Firefighters International, AFL-CIO, have voted unanimously to support other municipal employees' efforts to organize, said union spokesman Michael Ellis.

'Weekend at Bernie's' makes light summer entertainment

HOLLYWOOD — "Weekend at Bernie's" is a one-joke comedy as fragile as a soap bubble.

It never self-destructs, but because it threatens to at every turn, it unleashes so many laughs that it could just end up a summer sleeper.

Writer Robert Klane, who has "Where's Momma?" among his credits, has taken an amusing premise, and director Ted Kotcheff and his young stars Andrew McCarthy and Jonathan Silverman run with it.

Review

McCarthy's laid-back Larry and Parker's up-tight Richard are decidedly junior executives at a Manhattan insurance company. So zealous is Richard that even on the hottest Saturday of the year he is reading computer printouts, when he discovers that \$2 million has been paid out to a man already dead. Wow! He and Larry believe that this bit of information is sure to make their careers.

Sure enough, the top guy Bernie Lomax (Terry Kiser), slick woman-

chaser and coke-sniffer, is impressed with the detective work — enough to invite the guys out for Labor Day weekend at his place in the Hamptons.

It never occurs to them that maybe Richard was not supposed to have been such a zealous investigator. But it is Bernie who promptly winds up a corpse.

Klane ingeniously comes up with all sorts of happenings to keep Larry and Richard from contacting the police, and they soon have good reason to believe that it is imperative that

everyone believe Bernie is still alive (it is not all that hard, for apparently Bernie's pals are used to seeing him zonked out).

No, "Weekend at Bernie's" is not the sly, darkly humorous "wandering corpse" picture that Hitchcock's "The Trouble With Harry" is. It can't in fact be accused of possessing so much as a shred of subtlety, but as broad farce it is not only cleverly sustained but frequently hilarious.

What's more, a weekend among the rich, the jaded and the corrupt is just the right cup of tea for an acid

social satirist such as Kotcheff (who casts himself in an amusing cameo as Richard's father).

Silverman, who starred in the film of "Brighton Beach Memoirs," and McCarthy are deft and likable, but they are upstaged by Kiser. The Broadway and TV veteran may be funny as a decadent crook, but he is outright hilarious as the corpse who just never seems to stay put.

Little more than seeming understandably perplexed by the frantic Richard's behavior is required of Catherine Mary Stewart, but she has

a warm and lovely presence. Don Calfa and Catherine Parks get fresh laughs from those familiar gangster types, the heartless hit man and the sexpot mistress.

Production designer Peter Jamison's settings add much to the humor, especially Bernie's high-tech beach house, big enough for a small air terminal, lux enough for Gordon Gekko (More detailed is Richard's parents' perfect '60s apartment).

As a light summer refreshment "Weekend at Bernie's" (rated an appropriate PG-13) hits the spot.

60th All-Star Game — We can look for strong offense from both AL, NL

What can we expect when the teams take the field at Anaheim Stadium for baseball's "60th All-Star Game," Tuesday night, July 11, on NBC?

As always, fans are hoping for plenty of offense, and the American League stands ready to oblige. You can expect Minnesota Twins star and fan favorite Kirby Puckett to generate some excitement through his prowess with the bat. The AL has plenty of power, with the likes of Puckett, Oakland Athletic muscleman Mark McGwire and Kansas City Royal superstar Bo Jackson.

The National League is not lacking in power, either. San Francisco Giant Kevin Mitchell is a league leader and can put one in the bleachers at any time. And New York Met Darryl Strawberry has been known to hit the ball so hard that it's still on the rise as it clears the fence.

Another player expected to contribute to the NL is the St. Louis Cardinals' Gold Glove shortstop Ozie Smith, who is touted as the best ever to play the position by many experts. Smith may have lost a step over the past few seasons defensively, but his offense has picked up the slack.

On the sentimental side, fans seem to want Mike Schmidt to make one final All-Star appearance. Earlier

this season, he tearfully announced his retirement from baseball after 18 seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies. A perennial All-Star, Schmidt hit 35 or more home runs 11 times, won 10 Gold Gloves at third base and is no doubt headed for the Hall of Fame.

But if history is any guide, fans might be advised to settle in for a long pitchers' duel on July 11. The last All-Star Game at Anaheim Stadium — July 11, 1967 — was the longest contest in that game's history, 16 innings. In the end, the National League edged out the American League, 2-1.

The game was without a doubt a pitchers' battle: Twelve pitchers combined to register a total of 30 strikeouts, an All-Star Game record. American League batters whiffed 17 times, and National League batters fanned 13 times. Ferguson-Jenkins of the NL's Chicago Cubs led all pitchers with six strikeouts.

In another oddity, all the runs in the game came off solo home runs. For the NL, Dick Allen of the Phillies and Tony Perez of the Cincinnati Reds each homered — Perez in the 15th inning for the game-winner. Baltimore Oriole great Brooks Robinson

homered for the AL.

The lineups included many greats of the game who have become legends, including NL immortals Lou Brock (Cardinals); Willie Mays (Giants); Roberto Clemente (Pittsburgh Pirates); and Henry Aaron (Atlanta Braves). The AL roster boasted such stars as Mickey Vernon (New York Yankees); Carl Yastrzemski (Boston Red Sox); Tony Oliva (Twins) and, of course, Brooks Robinson. And a young New York Met pitcher named Tom Seaver made his All-Star debut. He will be one of NBC's announcers on July 11.

Many offense-minded sportswriters complained that the 1967 All-Star Game was the most boring they had ever witnessed. But others countered that, if you like pitching, it was an outstanding game.

And, if history repeats itself, that old rhubarb will, too.

Clayton Prince adds to his character

Originally, the character of Reuben Lawrence on "Another World" was just a bad kid, due to be killed off in six months. Beating up his girlfriend, Reuben stood for sullen menace, another loser to be discarded. However, young Clayton Prince made soap writers sit up and take notice last winter. Why was this character so mixed up?

The question excited writers and pumped new life into the temporary character who slowly revealed a more-complicated personality. Using Clayton's wit, Reuben mixed cynicism with humor, and negativism with a new approach.

Further exploration of Reuben's difficulties made sense. "I'm the middle child," Clayton says about Reuben. "I have a younger brother who is a genius with an I.Q. of 200, in college at age 16. My oldest sister is a nurse and I'm just average, wondering why I'm so different. I want to be like the others but I can't keep up, so I do terrible things."

A funny thing happened when writers turned a one dimensional character into a human being rather than a robot. Fans became hooked. Geared to entice the kids, Reuben also intrigued grown-ups. Since it's bad form to kill off a winner, Reuben's death warrant was canceled and Clayton Prince now sports a new three-year contract.

Understanding Reuben means caring about the villain rather than booing him. "Now fans can secretly hope Reuben can get away with his stunts," adds Clayton. "That couldn't be better for me. I have to pinch myself in the morning to believe this is happening."

The young actor credits Philadelphia's High School of Performing Arts with his success. "For me," says Clayton, "it was a great school. I couldn't have made it without the support and encouragement of those teachers.

I used to think I had talent but I really didn't know. I see actors who push hard and think that they have it but they don't. You can tell in a minute. Could this be me? I think I can handle situations or at least, know which ones to avoid. I don't think I fool myself."

Originally a math major who gave up Temple University for show business, Clayton intends to return to college one day but not as a math major. He says, "I'll finish just to learn other things."

With the syndicated drama "Luther's Choices" on the market, which tells the story of a Philadelphia gang leader who finally went straight, plus the soap, Clayton is sticking around New York, even though he loves Los Angeles.

"I enjoy L.A.," says Clayton. "I love the beach at Venice (Calif.) and best of all, I like driving. Back in Philly, I had a license at 16 and we used to go cruising. You can't go cruising in New York. Oh, to go cruising again. I wouldn't even mind those L.A. gridlocks. You just turn on the radio and cruise along."

Cellular telephones, TV let the world witness bloody repression in China

The cellular telephone and fax machine are very much symbols of the Yuppified '80s, but recently they were used to make a cry of the '60s come true.

"The whole world is watching" was the chant of anti-war demonstrators in Chicago during the Democratic convention of 1968. And indeed, if not the whole world, at least significant portions of the American population watched the brutal police tactics that became a significant log that helped break the back of support for American involvement in the Vietnam war.

As the month-long pro-democracy demonstrations in China came to their immensely more brutal and bloody conclusion a month ago, a much greater portion of the whole world was watching. Now linked by satellites and used to instant visual communication with all parts of the globe, the world found it necessary to view a patchwork quilt of communications out of China as the repression came down.

The crucial bits of information were relayed live by television reporters and producers linked by telephone to the United States as they traveled the mean streets of Beijing with their cellular companions. To ensure that the Chinese people were part of the whole world that was watching, fax machines were put to work, sending in the front pages of newspapers from Hong Kong and other locations, letting the Chinese people know what had happened to the protesters.

Eventually, the fax came to television's rescue as the Chinese authorities cut off the networks' access to the satellites, but the news divisions discovered a new device that allows a video picture to be sent via a fax machine. It was a still shot, but it was as close to live as you could get.

Most of the TV pictures we saw were half a day or so old as the videotape was flown to Hong Kong for satellite transmission. The

Chinese government displayed an odd attitude throughout this, cutting off the satellite, pushing around a few reporters, expelling others, but never coming down with the tough news blackout many expected.

Probably the government wanted to maintain as much as possible a sense of business as usual and a news blackout would have done more damage to that facade than the negative reports that were flowing out. But, this lack of action was also an acknowledgement that in this age of instant global communication, once you have allowed the electronic beams into your country, there is really no going back. You're connected, the whole world is watching, and you have to learn to deal with it.

Television's performance during the pro-democracy demonstrations and their tragic end drew plaudits from many commentators, and was the cause of many self-congratulatory conversations on the networks themselves. Indeed, it was a remarkable moment in the medium's history, further proof that the presence of the audience that TV can deliver has the power to change a performance on the other side of the globe.

But, in the weeks since the crackdown, you have heard less and less about the liberating power of television. One reason is that, though it may have lessened some of its harsher aspects, ultimately the fact that the whole world was watching had little effect on the route taken by China's leaders.

But more importantly, those leaders have shown that they understand the power of this medium as well, and their use of it has been a bleak Orwellian vision come true. They have shown us the dark side of this medium that can bring so much light.

Throughout the country, China's television sets were immediately flooded with the images of the government's vision of the repression of the demonstrations. Many of these pictures, showing tanks and soldiers under attack, were taken from Big Brother-style cameras that appar-

ently record all the happenings on many streets in Beijing. Pictures of the leaders of the movement were broadcast and citizens were urged to turn them in as public enemies.

The terrifying aspect to this is that it works. News reports from the country made clear that the government's TV campaign had swept away the impression made by the faxed front pages. Much of the country was coming to accept as fact that the demonstrations were dominated not by idealistic students, but by thugs and troublemakers. Many of the wanted individuals were quickly reported and arrested. The second wave of televised propaganda, promoting the Army as the friend of the people, is now under way.

The bottom line is that recent events in China prove that television is a very powerful tool, and, like all such instruments, in the right hands can do a great deal of good, and in the wrong hands can do immeasurable harm.

And so as we celebrate another anniversary of our independence, it is a good time to look at whose hands our television is in. Though our system would never allow the type of monopolistic domination of images that the Chinese government forced on its populace, we should do all that we can to insure that as many different voices as possible are allowed to be heard through this most potent of media.

The news of today tells us of the potential merger of Time-Life with either Warner Communications or Paramount. Whichever of those comes about, the result would be a loss of a major independent vision that currently comes to us over television.

Also in the news is the attempt by the networks to relax the rules that keep them from owning very many of the programs that they broadcast. The idea behind this regulation was to keep the people who controlled the access to the medium — the networks — from also controlling what was made for that medium.

John Denver wants to play horseshoes at White House

NEW YORK (AP) — John Denver had more in mind than playing guitar when he signed on as host of the first "In Performance at the White House" of the Bush administration.

"I have a personal agenda in this. I want to play horseshoes with the president," Denver said on a recent visit to New York as host of a United Nations dinner on World Environment Day.

"I have tandem (horseshoe) pits at my home," Denver said. "I've been home in April and May for the first time in over 10 years, and my game has sharpened."

The one-hour "In Performance at the White House" airs on PBS. It also features actor Barry Bostwick, opera star Simon Estes, Broadway singer Judy Kaye, the ragtime ensemble from the Marine Band and ragtime pianist Joshua Rifkin.

The executive producer of the show, John Musilli, presented President and Mrs. Bush with

several possible formats for this season's "In Performance at the White House" series. They selected one based on Earl Robinson's song, "The House I Live In," referring both to the White House and the United States. Musilli chose Denver as host of the opening concert.

"I called the Bushes," Musilli said. "They said, 'That would be terrific. Do you think he'll do it?'"

Denver, who was delighted to accept, said, "Mr. Bush attended my first concert at Carnegie Hall, in 1971, I think. I think he has been a fan of mine."

Musilli hopes the two other shows in the series, like this post-Fourth of July special, will have holiday themes, airing around Columbus Day and Thanksgiving.

The "In Performance at the White House" season in the Reagan administration featured Broadway music.

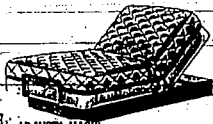

Documentary captures sense of schizophrenia's damages

For all its potential to do so, television rarely projects a sense of true intimacy. The presence of a camera usually seems to create a distance between viewer and those on the screen. But at times during "Into Madness: America Undercover," viewers may squirm and feel like looking away, as if they are eavesdropping on private moments.

The documentary on the mysterious mental disorder known as schizophrenia premieres on the HBO cable service. And while it does not hold out hope for any cure, the show so powerfully projects the pain and puzzle of this disease that strikes one of every 100 Americans, usually between the ages of 16 and 25.

Emmy-winning filmmakers Alan and Susan Raymond, whose "Elvis '56" documentary about the year Elvis Presley became famous offered someaching insight into the creation of a mythical star, amazingly found three families willing to share their experiences with the camera.

Ironically, while the focus of the film is on Bob, Missy and Steven, three victims of various levels of schizophrenia, it is the strength and vulnerability of their parents that comes through most powerfully.

"This is just a wasted life, of his life-and-of-ours, too," says the mother of Bob, a 35-year-old West Virginia man who was stricken in his first year of college.

"The next day, almost overnight, in a period of weeks she was gone," echoes the mother of Missy, a 27-year-old California girl who became ill at 15. Her father adds, "you kind of die a little bit."

And the father of Steven, a 28-year-old New York man institutionalized because of violent episodes, matter-of-factly describes a beating he suffered from his son. Yet moments later, we see him playing baseball with Steven — still a loving parent and still responsible.

"Into Madness" is hardly easy watching, but it provokes some thought on the mysteries of life, and the meaning of parental commitment.



'Charles in Charge' gets new family with its syndication

Q: When and why was the family of 'Charles in Charge' changed?
A: When the Scott Baio series went from network (CBS, 1984-85) into first-run syndication, most of the original cast was changed to give the program a slightly different direction. There have been some more modifications since, most notably the introduction of Ellen Travolta as his mother (who this past season became a regular on the show). Incidentally, "Charles in Charge" has been renewed for its fourth season. The new episodes will start turning up after the first of the year.
Q: Who plays the part of "Mouse" on "Beauty and the Beast"? What's his background?
A: Born in Newport Beach, Calif., David Greenlee, 25, is best known for portraying Dwight Mendenhall for four seasons on "Fame." He also appeared as Herbie, a regular on "Spenser: For Hire," and made guest appearances on "The New Twilight Zone," "21 Jump Street," "Mr. Belvedere," "It's

Garry Shandling's Show" and three "CBS After-school Specials." Also among his credits are the feature films "Iron Eagle," "Distant Thunder" and "Spinal Tap."
Q: On "Dennis the Menace," when did the first Mr. Wilson pass away? How did they make the transition in the series?
A: Joseph Kearns, the first Mr. Wilson, died during the 1961-62 season (the series began in the fall of 1959) and was replaced by veteran actor Gale Gordon ("Our Miss Brooks," "Pete and Gladys," and various versions of "The Lucy Show"). Gordon was introduced in May 1962 as the original Mr. Wilson's visiting brother John, who moved into the Wilson house the following season (with new wife Sara Seegar replacing Sylvia Field).
