Defense bill grounds Midgetman

WASHINGTON — The House approved a \$295 billion defense bill Thursday night that suspends production of President Bush's stealth bomber, cuts money for Star Wars and strips out \$100 million the administration sought for the Midgetman missile.

By a vote of 261-162, the Democratic-controlled House adopted the bill that was changed in the final minutes by an odd coalition of Republicans, angered by the cut of \$602 million in funds to put some existing MX missiles in rail cars, and liberal Democrats, opposed to the planned Midgetman missile.

The bill also includes money for the Navy's F-14D jet fighter and the Marine Corps' V-22 Osprey vertical lift-off assault transport — two programs Bush planned to scrap.

"A cut-throat happened after we voted to support the amendment (for MX and Midgetman), a measure to gut the MX rail garrison," said Rep. William Dickinson, R-Ala., ranking GOP member on the House Armed Services Committee, in introducing a motion to recommit the defense bill to committee.

"Take the game, OK. Take out \$200 million for rail-car-borne MX and Midgetman," he said.

Rep. Les Aspin, D-Wis., chairman of the Armed Services Committee, urged members not to approve a "motion of spite" and "blow up everything." But by a vote of 178-50, a count taken as members stood, the House approved the revision eliminating all the money for the single-warhead Midgetman missile.

House and Senate conferees will meet after the August recess to craft a final defense bill.

The House's military spending blueprint halts production of the B-2 stealth bomber, priced at about \$200 million a copy, until the Pentagon scales back its \$70 billion, 132-plane program.

The bill also requires the administration to show the B-2 is a proven plane before production resumes.

Jerome industrial park catches on

Keebler distribution center, warehouse-office complex will be built soon

JEROME — It's too soon to pronounce the patient completely cured, but one local analyst says commercial development in Jerome's industrial park will aid the county's economic recuperation.

Construction is set to begin within two weeks on a distribution center for Illinois-based Keebler Co. Inc. and on a warehouse and office complex to be built by two Nampa contractors.

Developers for both projects say Jerome's location and its proximity to the interstate attracted them to the industrial park located south of town.

Jerome County has a long way to go before it's completely recovered from the

closure of the Tupperware plant and the loss of more than 700 jobs, said Lon McDonald, labor analyst for Job Service in Twin Falls.

"But it's a positive thing that the industrial park is getting a lot of activity," he said.

Last week Jim Stiert, a Billings, Mont., investor, purchased 5.2 acres in the industrial park south of Jerome. He plans to build a \$1 1/2-million-to-\$2-million distribution center that will be leased and operated by Keebler, a cookie and cracker maker.

The masonry building will cover 28,000 square feet and will bring 12 to 15 new jobs to Jerome, Stiert said.

The real estate transaction was handled by Bonnie Ross of Pioneer Realty

in Jerome.

"I'm quite impressed with the building plans," she said.

Stiert said he owns other Keebler distribution centers throughout the country. They are more than just warehouses, he emphasized. The center will include offices as well as lounge and shower facilities for truckers.

Keebler executives did not return calls from The Times-News on Thursday. But Stiert said he expects the company will close its Pocatello distribution center after the Jerome center opens in December.

The 5.2-acre parcel next to the Keebler site is being purchased by Nampa builders Dan Hansen and Ivan Rice for a warehouse and office project.

Barrow should close next week," said Gerald Martens, an engineering consultant with EHM Engineers Inc. in Twin Falls, who will supervise the project's construction.

Martens said Hansen and Rice may use a third of the building for an electrical supply warehouse, and the other two offices will be leased to transportation companies.

The \$225,000-Hansen-Rice building will cover 16,000 square feet in its first phase, Martens said.

The industrial park land was purchased for approximately \$27,000 and offers plenty of room for expansion, he said.

When completed, Martens believes the Hansen-Rice complex will generate 10 to 20 new jobs.

Flag protection bill receives panel approval

WASHINGTON — A House committee on Thursday approved a flag protection bill that was pushed by Democrats but dismissed by Republicans as useless for overcoming the Supreme Court ruling permitting flag burning.

One Democratic leader said he and others in his party would "go to the wall" to block a constitutional amendment against flag desecration, which the Republicans and President Bush say is necessary.

The House Judiciary Committee, in a quorrelsome session, voted 28-6 for a statute that says, "Whoever knowingly mutilates, defaces, burns or tramples upon any flag of the United States shall be fined under this title or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both."

All but one of the 13 Republicans voting supported the bill — as a symbolic gesture for the flag, one said. But the Republican leadership blocked the Democrats' plan to bring the bill before the full House next week.

House Republican Leader Bob Michel, of Illinois, told reporters that White House Chief of Staff John Sununu urged the GOP leadership this week to speak out more

Baltic republics gain trade victory

MOSCOW — The Supreme Soviet passed resolutions Thursday that would give the three Baltic republics economic independence by Jan. 1 and free them to trade with the other Soviet republics.

"The national legislature's action was a major victory for Baltic activists. They have complained for years that Moscow ministries are exploiting the once-independent republics, taking away their natural resources and giving little back.

"The decision taken today was unprecedented. There hasn't been anything like it in our whole history. It will serve to strengthen the politics and economy of both the republics and the entire union," commentator Sergei Medvedev said on state TV.

Spray plane dusts Homedale houses

HOMEDALE — "A bunch of houses" were inadvertently sprayed by a crop duster plane early Sunday in Homedale and residents are uncertain what impact it will have on them, Homedale Police Chief Mike Moysard said.

"There were a few houses totally inundated with this stuff," Moysard said. "We recommend that anybody with a garden should be extremely careful. Parathion can also effect livestock."

A plane operated by Davison's Air Service in Homedale dropped a load at about 8 a.m. Sunday, Moysard said. The spray reportedly contained Parathion mixed with Ambush and Metaxystox-R, two other insecticides.

The plane was flying at night because the spray kills cutter bees, which are used to spread pollen during the day, Moysard said.

Members of two families have reported the spray made them sick and several have had blood tests taken, Moysard said. Four rabbits reportedly died at one home.

"A few people are but about not knowing about it," Moysard said. "But I didn't have the information... I started running down whose field it was, who was spraying it and found out what the spray was."

The state Department of Agriculture is investigating the incident, he said.

Americans obsessed with 'constantly changing' Jackie O at 60

You might start with the moment of horror: the image of the young woman in a pink Chanel suit frantically crawling across the back of the presidential limousine on that fateful November day in Dallas. Or you might begin with the photograph of a woman in black, her traumatized face shrouded in a heavy veil, walking behind a riderless horse in the funeral procession of her husband, the 35th president of the United States. Dark images.

But it requires light as well as shadow to compose a photograph. Or a life. So you might want to begin with other, happier images: a young, vibrant mother frolicking in the Hyannis Port surf with her

photogenic children, Caroline and John-John; a presidential wife, fashionably turned out in the bouffant hairdo and pillbox hat she made famous, standing next to her husband, John F. Kennedy.

The images, standing: an older and somewhat dated-looking bride at her wedding to Greek millionaire Aristotle Onassis; a mother attending her son's college graduation and her daughter's wedding; a grandmother to Caroline's 13-month-old daughter.

We have watched her triumphs and tragedies, her ascents and descents in the public's estimation for more than 35 years now, but it still comes as a shock to find that Jacqueline Bouvier Kennedy Onassis turns 60 today.

She's a \$45,000-a-year book editor

at Doubleday in New York now; a working woman, albeit one whose personal fortune is estimated at \$200 million. And by all accounts, after the storm and stress of her earlier years, she leads a satisfying life located somewhere on the Manhattan, N.Y., literati-socialite nexus; a quiet, private life punctuated with long holidays at her 400-acre estate on Martha's Vineyard or at her small, rented-house-in-the-Virginia hulk country.

But even though Mrs. Onassis has not been at the center of any newsworthy event for years, she continues to remain the target of intense public fascination and ambivalence. To some she is a woman who is well-known not because of her own accomplishments but because of her attachments to

famous men; to others she is a model of survival; a woman who has managed finally to create a life of her own. Some see her as self-centered and extravagant; others as sensitive and artistic.

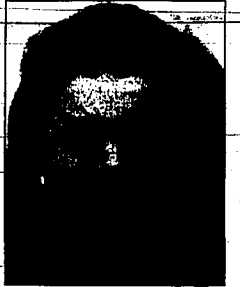
As usual Mrs. Onassis, arguably the best-known woman in the world, remains silent and, in the truest sense, unknown outside of her personal circle. After 22 Jackie biographies and several television movies based on her life, we still want more; we still wonder who Jackie Onassis really is.

The question is: Why? "I think she's gripped our imagination for three decades because she has been constantly changing before our eyes," said Edward Klein, a contributing editor to Vanity Fair and personal friend of

Mrs. Onassis. "First, she was the beautiful, dewy-eyed ingénue of Camelot, then the sad widow of our martyred president. Then, suddenly, unexpectedly, she shocked us by marrying Onassis for, at least in the eyes of many people, his money. Then when all that was over and it seemed there was nothing left, she emerged — as the triumphant mother of two very well-adjusted children."

And, Klein said, as we learn more about the circumstances of Jackie Onassis' life — particularly with the late President Kennedy — we seem to be revising our opinions about her.

"Now that all this stuff has come out about her first husband's philandering and her second husband's use of her as a kind of

Area tribes plan to have their own version of lottery soon

FORT HALL (AP) — The Shoshone-Bannock Tribes plan to begin their own version of the Idaho State Lottery Saturday despite the disapproval of the Idaho attorney general.

Marvin Osborne, former chairman of the Fort Hall Business Council, said when Attorney General Jim Jones contends that the tribes need to enter into an agreement with the state before conducting any type of gaming, the Business Council believes otherwise.

"The National Indian Gaming Act gives us the authority," he said.

"We only need approval from the state if we plan to have slot machines and other casino-type gaming, which we have no intention of doing."

The game the tribes will run is lotto, a type of mini-lottery. Osborne said, not the scratch type game the state is conducting. Tickets will be sold only at the Trading Post Complex, and the maximum payoff will be \$600.

Jones said Thursday the state's response to the tribes' game will depend on what gaming class it falls under. If it's one that's not allowed without a compact with the state, the county prosecutor will have to

take action, he said. Jones said that under the National Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, county prosecutors are given jurisdiction on reservations to enforce the act.

He said under the act, the state has no jurisdiction over Class 2 games, but that lotto is on a 1 y considered a Class 2 game when conducted on the same premises and in conjunction with bingo.

"Bingo is a Class 2 game, but lotto by itself falls into the Class 3 category," he said. "What they're doing sounds more like a Class 3 game."

But he will have to study the game after it's in operation before deciding whether any action is required, Jones said. "Then we would have to go with the way we interpret the law as written by Congress."

Osborne said the tribes will move ahead with their plans as soon as

clearance is received from the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

"They've been dragging their feet about giving us approval because they've been fired up by the state," he said. Although the National Indian Gaming Commission hasn't yet been appointed, Osborne said, the tribes believe the precedent for gaming on reservations has been set by tribes in other states.

"There are tribes that have lottery or lotto," he said. "We're just following what's already taking place. We don't feel we're violating state law because the National Indian Gaming Act has already been approved."

Osborne said he expects some type of response from the state, but he doesn't believe it will be an attempt to stop the game.

"I think there's a lot of ill feelings and animosity toward tribes on this issue on the part of state government," Osborne said. "But they don't give us funding for any of our programs on the reservation, so they don't have jurisdiction over us. The only way they get any jurisdiction at all is when they slip in under some federal law."

Judge considers opening records in teacher-student sex soliciting case

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — A district judge says he will consider unsealing the records of a court proceeding against a former Coeur d'Alene teacher accused of soliciting sex from a female student.

First District Judge Richard Magnuson said he will consider a request filed by Spokane newspapers to open the records, unless the teacher, Larry Iaitt, or the prosecutor request a hearing on why the records should remain sealed.

Magnuson said in a Tuesday hearing that he believes the question of closed court records is one of critical importance.

The transcript and court minutes sought by the newspapers detail what happened at an April 5

preliminary hearing. Magistrate Eugene Marano ruled that Iaitt should be sent to district court to face a felony charge of solicitation to commit an infamous crime against nature. He closed the hearing and ordered sealed records of the proceeding.

The newspapers objected, arguing that the lower-court judge erred because he failed to conduct a hearing to determine whether the public's right to know outweighed the possibility that publicity would damage Iaitt's right to a fair trial or invade the alleged victim's privacy.

"We're not at all challenging the weight of the evidence," said Ed Anson, a Coeur d'Alene attorney who

represents the newspapers. "We're challenging that there was no evidence."

Iaitt did not attend the hearing. His attorney declined comment. Kootenai County Prosecutor Bill Douglas said his office will not request a hearing.

"It's the victim's desire to keep it closed," Douglas said. "Our position in this case is to abide by the victim's desire not to have the facts paraded around again."

Much of the discussion centered on the procedure to follow in challenging the magistrate's decision to close the hearing to the public. Idaho law does not precisely outline the process.

Former INEL manager praises Energy Secretary

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — James Watkins is the first Energy Secretary in a dozen years who knows enough or cares enough about the nation's nuclear weapons program, says former Idaho National Engineering Laboratory manager Trey Wade.

"I had more direct contact in the four or five months I was with Jim Watkins than eight years combined under (John) Herrington, (Donald) Hodel or (James) Edwards," said Wade. He left his INEL post in 1987 for a job in Washington as DOE acting assistant secretary for defense programs.

Wade has left his federal job and is preparing for a part-time teaching position at George Washington University. He said for Herrington and Hodel, nuclear weapons "was not their No. 1 priority going in or coming out."

Since much of the budgetary focus is on nuclear weapons, Wade said, the priorities of Herrington and Hodel "made it difficult for people like me." Wade was involved in nuclear weapons programs throughout his long DOE career.

According to two Democratic representatives, during debate on the Special Isotope Separation project, the competency of DOE management was almost as much of a question as the need for plutonium.

Senate OKs \$44.3 billion agriculture bill dropping export cap

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate moved on Thursday to boost federal spending above President Bush's request on a range of domestic food programs and prodded the government to do a more aggressive job of monitoring food labeling.

In approving a \$44.3 billion agriculture spending bill for fiscal 1990, the Senate also agreed to remove a cap on subsidies the government pays to commodity exporters.

Bush wants the subsidy ceiling eliminated, arguing that it hinders American efforts to win concessions at trade talks with the European Economic Community. But the House has already voted to retain the cap, with opponents saying increasing the spending would merely benefit mammoth grain export firms.

Senate passage of the bill, on a voice vote, means that senators must now reconcile their legislation with the \$42.1-billion version of the measure that the House approved on July 18.

The measure is one of the 13 annual appropriations bills for federal agencies. Fiscal 1990 begins

Oct. 1. The Senate would expand federal spending for an assortment of domestic food assistance programs to \$18.8 billion, \$1.5 billion more than Bush sought in the budget he sent Congress in February and \$2 billion above 1989 levels.

This includes \$4.9 billion for child nutrition programs, about the same as Bush's request; \$2.1 billion for food aid to women, infants and children; \$200 million above Bush's figure; and \$15.4 billion for food stamps, \$1.3 billion above the Bush number.

A report approved with the bill also directs the Food and Drug Administration to "move forward" with clarifying the meanings of "natural," "low-fat," "lite," and other terms food producers commonly place on their labels.

The report criticized the FDA for the slow pace and the mixed "signals" the agency has exhibited with its work on food labeling.

However, the report did not address the controversy over red dye No. 3, the food coloring that is considered a potential carcinogen. In its measure, the House ordered the

government to refrain from banning the food coloring until long-range studies of the dye's health effects are completed.

Report language is not legally binding. Agencies must take such commands seriously, however, or risk antagonizing lawmakers who can retaliate against offending bureaucrats in future bills.

The export subsidy cap — which this year limits payments from the Export Enhancement Program to \$70 million — was first imposed by Congress last year.

The bill provides \$11.6 billion for rural development and assistance programs, \$200 million above Bush's request.

The Commodity Credit Corp., the Agriculture Department agency that distributes price and income support payments to farmers, would get \$4.8 billion, the same as Bush's request and \$4 billion below this year's level. The savings arise from higher commodity prices — which drive down federal aid — and changes in the law.

The bill also sets aside \$67 million for AIDS research by FDA, \$17 million above this year's level.

As he has said he will do on all 13 appropriations bills, Sen. David Pryor, D-Ark., offered an amendment limiting the money the

government can spend for Agriculture Department to spending \$47.3 million next year to hire private contractors to conduct studies and do other agency work.

Historians say Reagan will have average rank

WASHINGTON (AP) — Six months after Ronald Reagan left the White House, historians and political scientists — asked to guess how history will rate his presidency — rank him "in the middle, between great and dreadful."

Calvin Coolidge's name keeps coming up in comparison.

"Coolidge was strong for keeping things from being done," says Lewis Gould, a University of Texas historian. He also says Reagan has elements of FDR in his ability to communicate. But he thinks that ultimately Reagan will wind up "in the middle, or lower-middle ranks."

Frank Freidel, professor emeritus at both Harvard and the University of Washington and a biographer of Franklin D. Roosevelt, doesn't draw the FDR analogy. Instead, he compares Reagan to Dwight Eisenhower.

"If I had to rank him right now, I would rank him as high as Dwight Eisenhower," says Freidel, 73. "Both were total charmers. Both clung to the same sort of small-town Middle

Western virtues. Both were men of principle. Both to a certain extent were hands-off presidents."

Eisenhower biographer Fred Greenstein of Princeton University, on the other hand, said Ike never had a scandal like Iran-Contra and never had his weaknesses laid bare in kiss-and-tell books like those that have come out about Reagan.

"I don't think he'll be rated high on competence," says Greenstein, who compares Reagan to scandal-singed Ulysses Grant — "someone who had substantial public support but left a rather messy legacy."

Political scientist Thomas Cronin of Colorado College says Reagan "will have to be judged as having made a consequence." He gives the former president top grades for his ceremonial roles "as the national cheerleader, the national chaplain; he was able to rally the American spirit."

On the other hand, Reagan "was insensitive to women's rights, civil rights, oblivious to what was going on in his own administration — the procurement scandal, HUD, Iran-Contra," Cronin says.

U.S. economic growth slows in spring while inflation surges

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. economic growth slowed to a lackluster annual rate of 1.7 percent in the spring while inflation, driven by higher food and energy costs, raced ahead at the fastest pace in more than six years, the government reported Thursday.

The Commerce Department said the gross national product, the broadest measure of economic

health, turned in its weakest showing since mid-1986 as growth was held back by a slump in auto sales and housing construction.

The Bush administration insisted that the GNP report did not raise the specter of an imminent recession, but private economists were not so confident.

They expressed concerns that the year-long effort on the part of the

Federal Reserve Board to fight inflation with higher interest rates had taken its toll on the economic recovery, which has already lasted a pentamite record of 6 1/2 years.

While the Federal Reserve has reversed course and is now lowering interest rates in an effort to keep the economy moving forward, some analysts worried that the about-face has come too late.

The 1.7 percent GNP increase in the April-June quarter was down sharply from a revised 3.7 percent advance in the first three months of the year although the January-March figure was inflated by a bounceback in the farm sector from last year's drought.

The second quarter growth rate was the weakest since a 0.8 percent rise in the third quarter of 1986, the

last time the economy skirted close to a recession.

Inflationary pressures grew more intense in the spring, as well, with a price index tied to the GNP rising at an annual rate of 4.9 percent, the biggest increase since 1982.

After driving up interest rates for a year, the Fed switched in June and since then has made three small moves to push rates lower, including

an easing move earlier this week. The adverse effects of the earlier tightening were apparent in the GNP report.

UAW fails in attempt to unionize Nissan plant

SMYRNA, Tenn. (AP) — Nissan employees voted overwhelmingly Thursday to keep the United Auto Workers out of their plant, denying the union a foothold in the nation's fully Japanese-owned auto plants.

"They can't give us anything we don't already have," worker Doty Lockhart said — 1,622 to 711 against the UAW at Nissan's sole U.S. plant.

The balloting Wednesday and Thursday came after an 18-month drive by the UAW and was seen as a test of union muscle and a challenge to automakers' strategy of locating plants in the traditionally anti-union South.

The union effort also represented a challenge to Japanese-style team management and Japanese industry's reputation for enlightened labor relations.

"It was like someone was trying to divide our family," worker Redgie Gentry said of the organizing drive at the 6-year-old plant, where pickups and Sedans are made.

After the vote, the UAW accused Nissan of misrepresentation and intimidation to keep out the union, including "captive audience" meetings and a barrage of anti-union videos on the plant TV system; in which the automaker warned employees would lose benefits if the union won.

Jerry Benefield, president of Nissan Motor Manufacturing U.S.A., denied any intimidation and said he was elated by the more than 2-to-1 margin of victory.

"I think the results of this election are very strong support for the participatory management philosophy here at the company and we're very happy we're going to continue that," he said.

Workers at the \$760 million plant, 30 miles southeast of Nashville have embraced Japanese-style management, in which they have a say in production and the shop floor is organized into teams whose members rotate tasks as often as every two hours.

But the UAW, which forced the vote by gathering signatures from 33 percent of Nissan's 2,400 assembly-line employees; claimed that the line

runs at a breakneck speed, injuring an estimated 18 percent of the workers.

The grievance could not overcome pocketbook issues in this so-called right-to-work state, where union membership is optional even at plants where the workers are represented by a union.

The UAW represents workers at joint Japanese-American auto plants but has no foothold in any of the three fully Japanese-owned factories: Nissan, Toyota at Georgetown, Ky.; and Honda at Marysville, Ohio. An effort to organize the Honda plant three years ago was dropped before coming to a vote because of lack of support.

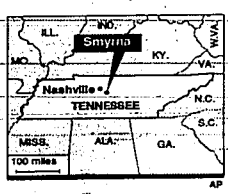
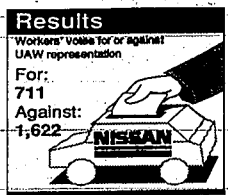
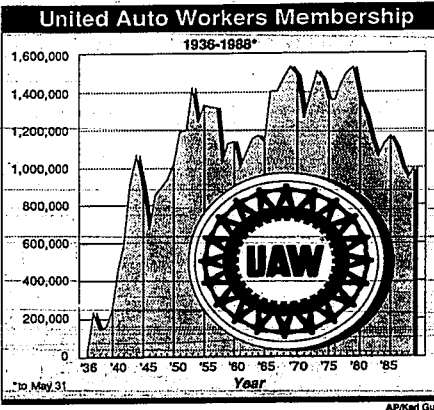
"It looks as if the Japanese-owned plants are going to stay non-union," said David Healey, an auto analyst with Drexel Burnham Lambert. "As long as Japanese-owned plants pay the same wages as the unionized plants the workers aren't going to vote for the union."

The vote was considered a show-down of sorts for the 1 million-member UAW, which has suffered a 33 percent decline in membership since 1979.

The UAW represents workers at a Mazda plant at Flat Rock, Mich., that also makes Ford's; a joint Chrysler-Mitsubishi plant near Bloomington, Ill., and a General Motors-Toyota factory at Fremont, Calif.

In a statement, UAW President Owen Bieber, Vice President Stan Marshall and Regional Director George Smith said: "All this election demonstrates is that when a company... is willing to use threats and misrepresentation to an unlimited extent, that company can delay if not escape its day of reckoning."

Democratic service bill on way to floor

WASHINGTON (AP) — A national service bill blending several Democratic proposals should be on its way to the floor next week, senators said Thursday in announcing the compromise measure.

Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., chairman of the Senate Labor and Human Resources Committee, said at least 10 national service bills ranging in cost from \$6 million to \$6 billion have been introduced this year in the Senate.

The \$380 million Democratic consensus package "includes the best features of all the bills, and the price tag is within realistic constraints," he said.

"The plan is designed to promote public service among Americans of all ages, with incentives including academic credit, stipends, job training, educational aid and a helping hand for first-time homebuyers."

Kennedy said his committee scheduled to complete work on the bill next week in preparation for floor action after the August recess.

Moreover, Kennedy and Senate Majority Leader George Mitchell, D-Maine, said they hope to achieve a bipartisan measure with Bush administration support.

"We will work with our Republican colleagues, our colleagues in the House, and with the White House" to pass national service legislation, said Mitchell.

Bush favors a purely voluntary approach to such service without incentives or stipends and has proposed a \$25 million program to encourage such efforts.

But Kennedy and others suggested there may be some room for compromise as the bill moves through Congress.

Bush joins those calling for counterspy efforts

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush on Thursday added his voice to those advocating improved U.S. counterintelligence efforts since disclosure that diplomat Felix S. Bloch is under investigation as a possible Soviet spy.

Bush's remarks came not long after government sources familiar with the case said that the 54-year-old State Department official could remain free for a long time while FBI agents try to identify specific secrets, if any, that he may have turned over to the Soviets.

Agents are engaged in what is expected to be a lengthy, painstaking and possibly futile search for the specific evidence required under the Espionage Act, or for circumstantial evidence sufficient to provoke a confession, if Bloch is in fact a spy, according to these sources, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

For his part on Thursday, Bloch ended a three-night stay at his father's East Side co-op in New York City. Still trailed by FBI agents and reporters, he drove to his daughter's house in Chappaqua, N.Y., north of the city.

Bloch had taken refuge with his daughter Saturday after reporters, spurred by last Friday's disclosure of the investigation, joined the FBI agents encamped around his Washington apartment.

Bloch has not been charged. He was put on paid leave by the State Department June 22 and had his diplomatic passport lifted, but he is under no travel restrictions.

Bush, at a photo session in the Oval Office, told reporters, "The question is: Can we improve our counterintelligence? We always ought to be striving to do that. Can embassy security be improved? We go through this periodically and the answer is, I'm sure it can."

Earlier in the week, House Republican Whip Newt Gingrich of Georgia called for expanded U.S. surveillance of the Soviet KGB spy agency.

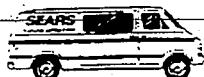

Senate OKs funding for new visitor center

HAGERMAN — The Senate has approved \$200,000 for planning and design of a visitor center at the new Hagerman Fossil Beds National Monument.

If the House goes along, the money will be included in the 1990 budget for the National Park Service, Sen. James McClure said Thursday.

Also included in the Park Service budget approved by the Senate is \$200,000 for management of the national monument. Some will be used to pay up to three full-time employees.

Legislation designating the fossil beds a natural monument was signed into law last October and in May, McClure helped the Park Service dedicate it.

The 6,000-acre national monument will protect and display some of the 310 registered fossil sites on the banks of the Snake River. The remains of ground sloths, saber-toothed cats, zebra-like horses, mastodons and other Pliocene Age species will be displayed.

Board to examine problems of underground storage

BOISE — A legislative study committee will take a close look at the problems posed by underground storage tanks in an Oct. 9 hearing in Twin Falls.

The hearing, to collect testimony on underground tank problems, is part of a series of meetings that will begin next week in Boise.

Rep. John Sessions, R-Driggs, chairman of the House Transportation Committee, is cochairman of the study committee. He said Thursday it will conduct hearings Monday at the Statehouse on insurance and liability problems posed by underground storage tanks.

Monday's hearing starts at 9:30 a.m. at the House Majority Caucus Room.

Other hearings will be held Aug. 24 at Idaho Falls and Sept. 28 at Coeur d'Alene.

Vehicle registration must now occur within 30 days

TWIN FALLS — Idahoans who have purchased a car, truck, motorcycle, trailer or mobile home since July 1 must apply for title at a county assessor's office within 30 days or pay a late fee.

New legislation requires a \$25 penalty to be assessed in addition to regular title fees if applications are not filed within 30 days. The penalty increases to \$50 for applications filed 30 or more days after purchase.

20th Wood River resource tour slated for Aug. 1

Canal company wins right to appeal

TWIN FALLS — The Salmon River Canal Co. has won the right to appeal an earlier verdict that found shareholders responsible for 1984 flood damage.

The state's Supreme Court has agreed to hear an appeal on the liability issue, said Lloyd Webb, lawyer for the Salmon River Canal Co.

Webb filed his appeal late Thursday. John Hepworth, attorney for the downstream landowners who won the suit, was unavailable for comment.

In the original suit, downstream landowners claimed they suffered more than \$1 million in damages from a flood that occurred after the canal company released water from its nearby full dam, causing Salmon Falls Creek to overflow.

In January, a Twin Falls County jury decided Salmon Tract farmers, as Salmon River Canal Co. shareholders, should pay 80 percent of the damages to downstream farms and landowners. The exact amount would be determined at a second trial.

The jury also found the Buhl and Twin Falls highway districts partially responsible for the damage because district workers cut into a

highway crossing to release pent-up water.

But in post-trial actions, 5th District Judge George Grnata ruled the highway districts didn't have to pay anything. His ruling then left Salmon Tract farmers wholly responsible for the bill.

At the time Grnata's post-trial ruling was announced, Jim Patrick, a Salmon River Canal board member, said the farmers couldn't pay the downstream landowners' claims.

"It's always been our position that there should be no liability," Webb said Thursday. Webb said the state Supreme Court could

Is Twin Falls fireproof?

Insurance rates could depend on inspectors' rating

TWIN FALLS — Visiting inspectors are examining the city's fire defenses, and fire insurance premiums could change as a result.

How well prepared the city is "to put the wet stuff on the red stuff" is the focus of the Idaho Survey and Rating Bureau, said Victor Paul, superintendent of public fire protection for the group.

City Fire Division Commander Phil Clough said the result could have a direct bearing on what home and business owners will pay for fire insurance for several years.

Paul is in Twin Falls this week to look at the various components of the city's fire-fighting system: equipment, personnel, water supplies and the city's communications network.

How well each part works and how the whole system meshes will determine the city's fire rating, which is a gauge of how rapidly and effectively firefighters can respond to a fire.

The rating bureau, a private, non-profit organization supported by subscription fees

The truck stop would have fuel pumps, the RV park and a restaurant, Couch told the council. Future plans include a truck repair shop, truck washing facilities and a fast-food restaurant.

Winds fan 1400-acre Nevada fire

TWIN FALLS — Smoke from a large range fire in northeastern Nevada boiled over the South Hills toward Oakley Thursday afternoon.

Lightning sparked a fire in Big Draw area of Tijuana John Mountain just after noon Thursday, said Ron Ballard, fire dispatcher in the Elko BLM office.

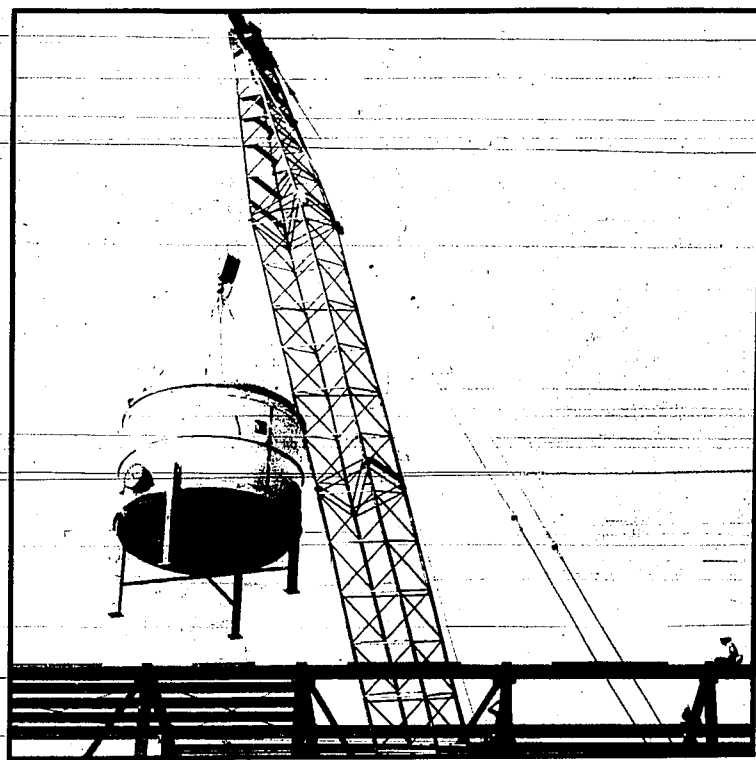
Strong winds fanned the fire, and it quickly grew to nearly 1,400 acres by late afternoon. When first spotted, the fire was covering 100 acres. About half an hour later it had tripled in size, Ballard said.

Winds about 20 to 25 knots from the southwest drove smoke from the fire, about 20 to 25 miles southeast of Jackpot and about 12 miles south of the Idaho border, northeast toward Oakley.

Four 1,000-gallon, four-wheel-drive tankers and two 300-gallon tankers from BLM's Burley District were sent south to help fight the fire. A helicopter also was dropping water on the fire Thursday afternoon.

The BLM reported about 2,000 lightning strikes in Southern Idaho since Wednesday's thunderstorms rolled through the Magic

New 'sugar train' part of expansion

TWIN FALLS — Amalgamated Sugar Co. is building a train that will run indoors. The "train" is what the company calls its state-of-the-art process that extracts sugar from molasses.

Amalgamated built one train last year that worked so well, a second is being added.

"We're doubling the capacity," said Gary Pool, technical assistant.

Instead of processing 180 tons of molasses a day, the plant will be able to do 360 tons.

This year's expansion, three stories high and costing \$6 million to \$7 million, is being built on top of last year's addition. Inside will be a series of eight huge pressurized cells that form the train. Water and molasses will flow through the cells and the sugar will separate out.

The new system won't be on line until March 1, 1990. However the molasses residue from this year's harvest will be

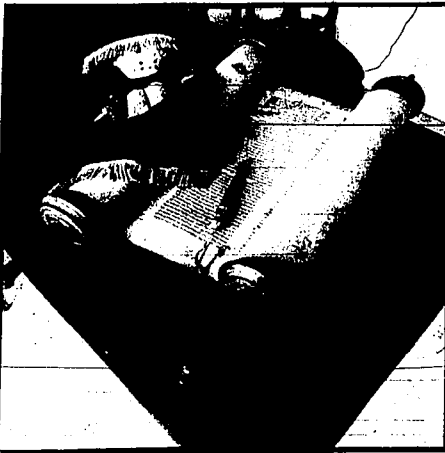
stored and processed later. The molasses sugar extraction process will normally run 300 days a year, Pool said.

No new employees will be required to operate the facility.

Amalgamated developed the new sugar extraction process to increase profitability. Molasses, one of the by-products of processing sugar beets, is low in sugar and sells for only \$6 a ton.

Processed sugar sells for \$500 a ton. Turning more molasses into sugar means turning more profit.

Sacred Torah has fascinating history

KETCHUM — An historic scroll representing the laws and teachings of the Jewish Scripture has found its way to a new home in Idaho.

The 99-year-old Czechoslovakian Torah is one of more than 1,600 Torahs which eluded Nazi control during World War II to be rescued and restored for use in modern Jewish synagogues worldwide.

"When you think of the people over the past 100 years that have stood and prayed over that Torah, it's pretty overwhelming," said Sue Mendelsohn, president of the Wood River Jewish Community. "We are just absolutely fortunate to have it here."

The Torah will be dedicated at 10 a.m. Saturday at the Presbyterian Church of the Big Wood. The ceremony, conducted by Rabbi Maurice Hershman of San Francisco, is open to the public.

Torah, a Hebrew word, means law and teaching and comprises the first five books of the Old Testament. It is the most sacred object in Jewish life and the tangible link that binds Jews together from generation to generation, Mendelsohn said. It is used in all Jewish observances.

Beginning with the book of Genesis, the scroll is unrolled and read from each Sabbath until Rosh Hashanah, the beginning of the Jewish New Year, when it is then rerolled to begin the process anew.

Slayer of Swedish head convicted

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) — A career criminal who haunted the streets of Stockholm in search of drugs and drink was convicted Thursday of murdering Prime Minister Olof Palme in 1986 and sentenced to life in prison.

Carl Gustav Christer Pettersson was found guilty by a Stockholm District Court panel of two professional judges and six lay jurors.

The two judges said there was not enough evidence to convict Pettersson, but they were outvoted by the lay jurors. A simple majority was needed for conviction.

Pettersson's attorney said he would appeal.

Bomb in letter kills postal worker

MARSEILLE, France (AP) — A letter bomb exploded Thursday in a mail sorting center, killing one postal employee and injuring two others, police said.

Investigators said the small package was addressed to a foreign destination, but did not say what country. They also did not say where the package originated.

There were no claims of responsibility for the bomb, which police said apparently was not intended to go off before it was delivered.

The dead postal employee was identified as Noel Guerin, 52. Two colleagues, Barthélemy Frau and Bruno Rivieri, were hospitalized with serious injuries, police said.

The explosion occurred on the sixth floor of a postal building near the central train station in the Mediterranean port city of Marseille.

Iran gears for post-Khomeini era

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) — Parliament Speaker Hashemi Rafsanjani appeared set to win presidential elections Friday and was reported to be already assembling a Cabinet to govern the Islamic republic in the post-Khomeini era.

Iran's religious and political leaders Thursday called for a big voter turnout to demonstrate unity following Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini's death June 3.

But their exhortations also appeared aimed at securing a big vote of confidence in Khomeini's heirs.

Castro slams U.S. in holiday speech

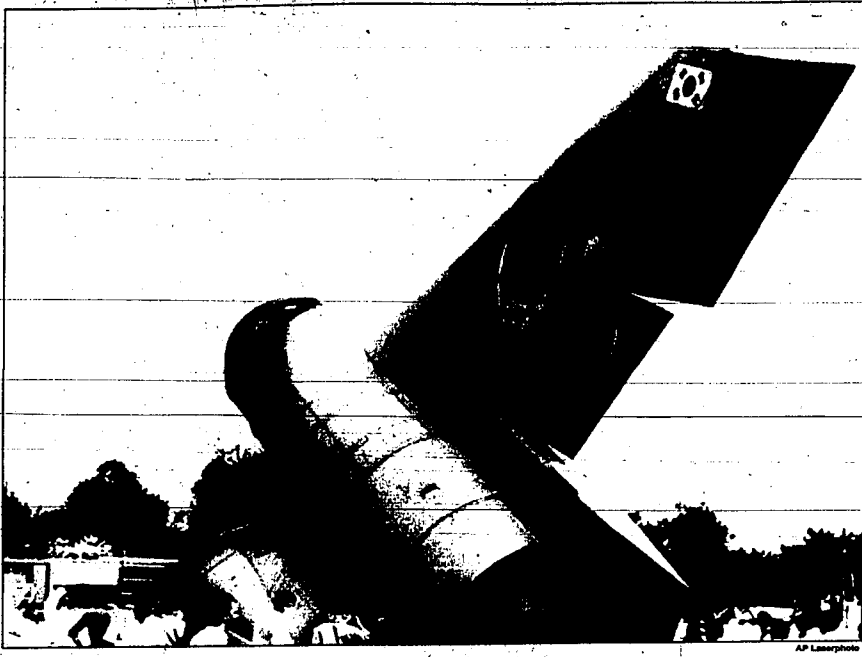
CAMAQUEY, Cuba (AP) — It was a rainy, gloomy evening and President Fidel Castro seemed in a kindred mood, speaking of "inhuman" American capitalists bent on a new colonialism, and of possible civil war in the Soviet Union.

This is the national holiday week that celebrates the beginning of the revolution in 1953, a time of picnics, parties, dancing and drinking.

Castro's two-hour message Wednesday, delivered in rain that soaked him to the skin the week before his 63rd birthday, was more appropriate for a wake.

He told the tens of thousands crowded into Camaguey's main plaza the United States was like Adolf Hitler's Germany, "dreaming about an empire of 1,000 years."

Cubans must prepare for a war of attrition, total blockade, even invasion and occupation, he said.

Korean DC-10 crashes in Libya; at least 82 dead

ROME (AP) — A Korean Air DC-10 jetliner crashed short of a regional airport in Tripoli, Libya, on Thursday, killing at least 82 people — including four on the ground — as it cartwheeled through an olive grove, authorities said.

It was the second crash of a DC-10 in eight days. A United Air Lines DC-10 crashed in Sioux City, Iowa, on July 19, killing 111 people.

The Korean plane, carrying 199 people, hit two houses and cars and split into three flaming pieces before it came to rest about a half-mile from the airport. More than 110 people were hospitalized, the official Libyan news agency reported.

Korean officials said most aboard Flight 803, which originated in Seoul, were South Koreans returning from vacation to their jobs — on engineering and construction projects in Libya.

There were about 78 dead from the plane, according to the first secretary of the South Korean

Embassy in Tripoli. The diplomat, who identified himself only as Mr. Chun, said Libyan officials reported that four people were killed when the plane's landing gear slammed into two houses.

Chun said many of the victims were badly burned, making a count of the dead difficult.

He said 18 crew members survived, and four of them were slightly injured. Also surviving were the three Japanese passengers, he said. All other passengers were South Korean except for seven Arabs, he said, and four of those, possibly Libyans, were believed killed.

The plane approached the airport in heavy fog, and Chun said there was no mechanical problem or explosion.

"We don't know if the pilot made an error or if the tower made an error," Chun said. "The captain is conscious. He thinks he did not do anything wrong."

Survivor Kwon Hyuk-hwi told the

Korean Broadcasting System he was reading a book in the first-class section when an announcement was made that the plane was about to land.

"Instantly there was a crushing impact and then came shrieks by horrified people. I kept my body as low as possible and lost consciousness," he said.

The plane cartwheeled for about 400 yards before breaking into pieces, another South Korean diplomat in Tripoli, Chang Kyung-soo, told Korean TV.

KBS said many of the Koreans on Flight 803 worked for Daewoo Corp. and Donga Construction Co., which have projects in Libya. Under Col. Moammar Gadhafi's 20-year regime, thousands of South Koreans have worked on construction and civil engineering projects.

The official Libyan news agency, JANA, said the plane slammed into two houses and hit cars on a road near the airport, which is set amid

groves of olive and lemon trees about 35 miles south of the coastal capital of Tripoli. The reports were monitored in Rome.

Italian TV showed the tail of the plane protruding from the ruins of a house. Rescuers carried bodies covered with white sheets and firefighters hosed down the smoldering wreckage.

The airline earlier quoted the plane's pilot, Kim Ho-jung, 54, as saying "the airport was shrouded in a dense fog and visibility was poor when I approached."

Mel Blanc tribute becomes media event

HOLLYWOOD — When Warner Bros. bought double-truck ads (two facing pages) in both Daily Variety and the Hollywood Reporter July 13, it was merely to pay tribute to the late Mel Blanc, "the man of a thousand voices," who died July 10. But due to a "tremendous response," said Kathleen Heppie, Warner's animation vice president, the studio ran an extra hundred copies and is now printing more for Warner executives and others "who were so touched" by the tribute.

The color illustration pictured such famous Warner Bros. cartoon characters as Bugs Bunny, Porky Pig and Daffy Duck — whose voices Blanc created — bowing their heads before a microphone standing alone in a spotlight. Heppie called it an "animation department effort" executed by artists Darrell Van Citters and Chris Buck.

Daily Variety got calls requesting unstepped copies for framing. The Reporter received similar inquiries and "pretty much sold out" of the issue, said Lynne Segall, director of marketing and sales.

HBO may develop China project based on protests

HOLLYWOOD — The world watched the drama that unfolded during the student-led pro-democracy demonstrations and ensuing massacre in Beijing's Tiananmen Square. Will it watch again — through Hollywood's eyes? A number of producers hope so.

So does HBO. An insider there says that the cable network is hungry for a China project, if the right one comes along.

Michael Manheim (TV's "Roe vs. Wade"), who is pursuing dramatic rights, said he is "in direct touch with the dissident student leaders in China — and elsewhere." Meaning Paris, where eight student leaders triumphantly surfaced recently on Bastille Day.

The project will be part of "The Human Rights Project" — a series of features-TV projects about "human rights heroes around the world." Manheim's company is partnered in the venture — "in the works long before China triumphed" — with RAI, Italy's premiere TV network, and producer Alex Ponti, with the support of several human rights organizations.

Paramount may be filming Tom Clancy's latest thriller

HOLLYWOOD — While Paramount shoots "Red October," the studio is also negotiating for film rights to author Tom Clancy's next techno-thriller, "Clear and Present Danger," due out Aug. 17 from G.P. Putnam and Sons. The book drew a pre-publication rave from Publisher's Weekly, which called it "the author's best work since 'The Hunt for Red October'."

"Red October" producer Mace Neufeld said that Paramount contractually has "first position" on the book — meaning first opportunity to negotiate in good faith.

"At the moment, we're right at the precipice (of negotiations)," said Clancy's New York agent, Robert Gottlieb of the William Morris Agency, while declining to name the studio. "We're expecting an offer shortly."

'Pink Panther' on TV will feature quality animation

HOLLYWOOD — When MGM-UA's "Pink Panther" series debuts next year on CBS — mixing animation and live action — do not expect the quality of "Who Framed Roger Rabbit." MGM-UA TV chief David Gerber says that the animation will be several cuts above typical Saturday morning fare, "but I don't think any TV show could emulate the technique of 'Roger Rabbit' ... without going bankrupt. We're going to concentrate on the character."

The series had been in the planning stages for nearly two years, without a green light. Then "Roger Rabbit" hit the big screen, said co-producer George Schenck, and its blockbuster success "helped make this possible. Before, no one thought it could be done."

The comic series about a feline that helps out a young reporter (Charlie Schlatter) could be a late-season replacement.

Twin Falls Municipal Band enjoys 84 years of entertaining

TWIN FALLS — Close to home is a claim to fame, of which few people are aware, even in this time of Centennial celebrations. The Twin Falls Municipal Band is the oldest continuously playing band west of the Mississippi River.

That, according to Gerald (Chop) Ridgeway, who has played cornet in the band for almost 60 years. Inquire about the band, and you are likely to be told, "Better ask Chop."

"There are other longtime bands west of the Mississippi, but many of them didn't play during the war," Ridgeway said. "Somehow, our band managed to find enough people to continue playing."

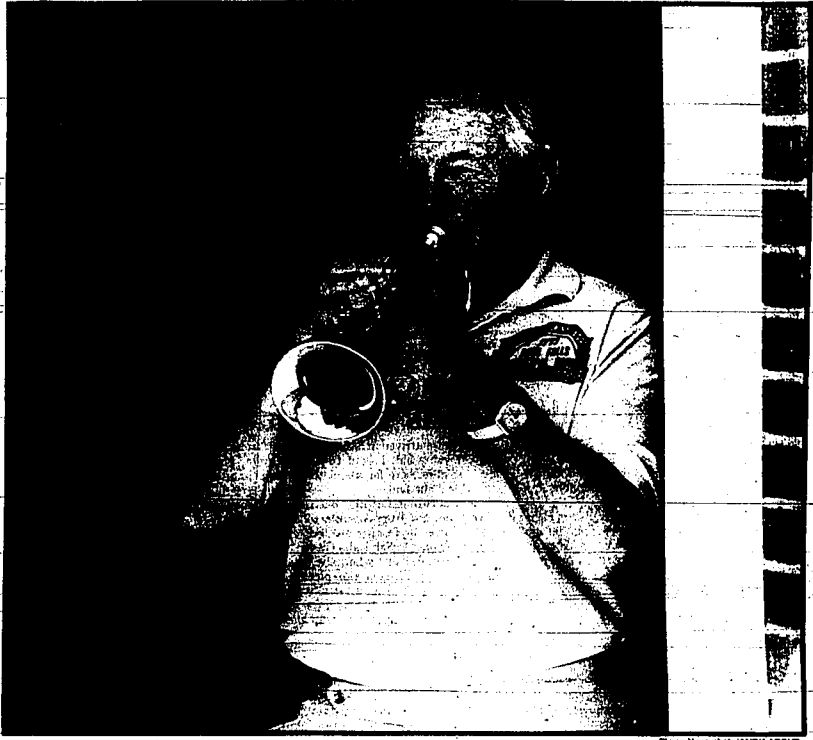
Now in its 84th season, the band is attracting larger audiences than ever. On any given Thursday night during the summer, more than 1,000 people can be found relaxing on blankets and lawn chairs in the city park, romping with their children; talking with their neighbors; and listening to the 50-member band.

"I think we played at every major event in the Magic Valley during those early years," said Ridgeway, 70, who caught the band bug from his father, a cornet player in the band between 1917 and 1937. "We opened the Hansen Bridge, and we were there for the CSI groundbreaking ceremony."

When asked about the biggest change in the band over the years, Ridgeway is quick to answer. "This was an all-male band until the '70s," he said.

The band is now made up of men and women from throughout the Magic Valley. There are music teachers, college instructors, attorneys, and housewives.

Some musical instruments have also changed through the years, Ridgeway

noted. "I got the cornet I'm now playing right after the war, and they don't make the small ones like this anymore," he said. "People wouldn't buy this kind today, because they don't make a big, loud sound like people want now."

Today's band members wear blue shirts, whereas they once dressed in bright green

uniforms with red trim. ("Too expensive these days," said Ridgeway.) No one is sure exactly how the band first began, although many believe it originated with three or four "tooters" who enjoyed getting together and making music.

According to one of the "old band's tales," the band once played under the leadership

of John Philip Sousa. Not true, says Ridgeway. "It is true that Sousa brought his band to Twin Falls for a concert in '27 or '28," he said. "I got to go to the concert, so now I'm known as the one who heard John Philip Sousa."

Ridgeway attributes the longtime success

Fay Wray fondly recalls early days in Salt Lake City

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) - The entire world knows Fay Wray, the screaming beauty in King Kong's immense hand. What few know is that the actress has fond memories of her childhood in Utah.
The gigantic ape was only a small part of her acting career. From 1923's silent film "Gasoline Love" to the 1980 TV movie "Gideon's Trumpet," she acted in close to 80 productions. And it all started in Salt Lake City.
"I certainly have good feelings about Utah," Wray said in a telephone interview from Los Angeles.

"I think we arrived in Salt Lake City when I was about 5 years old. I went to kindergarten, and then we were there for about three years in Salt Lake City," she said.
She was born in Canada, but the family moved to Arizona, and from Arizona to Salt Lake City. From there the family moved temporarily to Lark, then back to Salt Lake City.
Wray recalled that when she was 5 or 6 years old, she saw her first motion picture.
"I really didn't know what it was up there... I was fascinated with that because people seemed to be so happy, and there was the noise of the

projector in the back and a beam of light that went over our heads onto that screen," she said.
The family moved back to Salt Lake City when she was about 12 and she starred in a short historical movie sponsored by the Salt Lake Telegram.
A test shot for the film was made on the grounds of the City-County building. She was supposed to hold flowers in her arms, smell them and look pretty.
Next she was awarded the lead in the movie, called "Heritage of Souls."

Kenny Rogers.
In the early 70s, he moved back to Austin, Texas, and became part of the "Texas outlaw" country scene along with singers like Willie Nelson and Jerry Jeff Walker. But in 1976, he scored his big breakthrough on the pop charts with two haunting singles, "Wildfire" and "Carolina in the Pines."
Later in the decade, he notched the first of his successes in country,

where he's been racking up hits ever since. Among his songs are "Face in the Crowd" (a duet with Holly Dunn), "Radioland," "What She Wants" and a bittersweet duet with his son, Ryan, "Talkin' to the Wrong Man."
In the past few years, Murphey has expanded his reach via concerts with symphony orchestras. He has appeared with classical ensembles in Tennessee, New Mexico, Utah and Oklahoma, and usually performs about 10 such concerts a year.

In a recent interview, Murphey said both country and classical music have been relegated to "pigeonhole" status. He hopes to build bridges between the two, building on the work of such composers as Aaron Copland ("Billy the Kid") and Ferde Grofe ("The Grand Canyon Suite").
Murphey lives in Taos, N.M., with his wife, Mary, a former fashion model. He plays and sings solo at the Sagebrush Inn when he's not

traveling the North American fair, rodeo and concert hall circuits. He's also been active in environmental and Indian rights causes.
Seats for Monday's show - \$12 for stage front, \$10 for grandstand and \$6 for the bleachers - are available at the fairgrounds office from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays. If the show isn't sold out in advance, tickets will be available at the door.

of the band to dedicated individuals. Current music director Ted Hadley is only the fourth director under whom Ridgeway has played. "There are also several individuals who are nearing their 60th year with the band, Ridgeway explained.
"I remember one man who worked construction at Galena Summit during the summer and who drove the 100 miles back and forth every Thursday night to play in the band," he said. "It takes a nucleus of dedicated people like that to make this thing go."
Another reason for the band's success, according to Ridgeway, is people's love of music. "The music we play hasn't changed much through the years," said Ridgeway, who added that people like to hear something they recognize, whether it's really good music or not. "We play a lot of marches because people like them, and we do popular tunes

from Broadway shows, which are my own personal favorites."
The July 4 concert is usually a high point of the year for band members, said Ridgeway, who noted that there are 5,000 people or more at these events. One especially memorable concert, about five years ago, was attended by 300 students from a Rotary foreign exchange program who came through Twin Falls on July 4.
The band receives a small amount of funding from the city, but it is largely made up of a volunteer group of people who range in age from 17 to 70. Festivals are on Tuesday nights before the Thursday concerts. New members are recruited through invitations extended by other band members. Often, there is an end-of-the-year picnic.
Ridgeway is proud to be part of this well-established band. "I just enjoy playing," he said, "although I don't care a lot about practicing

any more."
Ridgeway contends that playing music can really get into the blood. He says his own sentiments were captured by Dr. Orrin Fuller, who wrote a history of the band for its 60th anniversary concert. "I continued to play concert with the band after I quit directing it," Fuller wrote, "until I ran out of wind and spit both at the same time."
Or maybe it never actually ends. Ridgeway's 10-year-old grandson is enthusiastically involved in cornet (now known as trumpet) lessons, determined to follow in his grandfather's footsteps.
"All of us enjoy getting out and playing music together," said Richard Cook, who has been playing French horn with the band for six years. "I hadn't planned to play this year, so I spent the first two concerts sitting in the audience listening," he said. "The next week, I was back on the bandstand."

Board delays greatest films decision

LOS ANGELES (AP) — It will be at least two months before movie fans learn which 25 films a panel of government-appointed critics and the Library of Congress considers the nation's best.

The 13 motion picture experts appointed under the National Film Preservation Act had planned to announce 25 nominated titles earlier this week.

Instead, worried that public nominations might prompt studios into premature marketing ploys and reveal panelists' personal biases, the panelists decided to send their individual choices in secret to Librarian James Billington.

Billington, with input from the motion picture division of the Library of Congress, then will make the final selection in late September, said George Kirgo, president of the Writers Guild of America and a member of the preservation panel.

An attorney for the Library of Congress and several panelists said the meeting was conducted secretly to dispel public confusion about the panel's work.

"When an evaluative meeting like this one is held, it is always closed, because that's the ethical way to conduct it," said Robert Rosen, a film archivist with the University of California, Los Angeles, and a member of the preservation panel.

Roger Mayer, president of Turner Entertainment Co., attended the public portions of the panel's meeting at UCLA because the selections carry so much potential commercial value for his company.

"We have a library of more than 3,500 pictures, so we're interested in what pictures are chosen," said Mayer. The Turner film library includes "Wizard of Oz," "Gone With the Wind," "Citizen Kane," "Casablanca" and "Singin' in the Rain."

The preservation act was drafted by Congress partly in response to complaints about the practice of adding color to old black-and-white films. Turner Entertainment has colored a number of its films.

The act calls for a panel to recommend 25 titles annually, chosen according to their cultural, historical and aesthetic interest, to be placed by the Library of Congress on a national film register.

The act does not forbid a movie's copyright holder from editing movies.

Film industry enjoying its greatest revenues ever thanks to sequels

HOLLYWOOD — The summer and end them all was 1984, when "Ghostbusters," "Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom," "Star Trek IV" and "The Karate Kid" combined for box-office grosses that studio executives and film exhibitors did not allow themselves to dream about. Now, with sequels of those same movies providing kindling, the summer of '89 is burning up even the records of '84.

So far, moviegoers have shelled out \$1.23 billion to see "Ghostbusters 2," "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade," "Star Trek V," and "The Karate Kid 3," as well as such blockbusters as "Batman" and "Lethal Weapon 2." At the midpoint of the summer, grosses are up 29 percent over last year and headed for Hollywood's first \$2 billion season.

There's no question about it, it's going to be the biggest summer ever, even allowing for the rise in ticket prices, said John Krier, president of Exhibitor Relations Co., an Los Angeles-based company that compiles box office figures.

Still to come are 20th Century Fox's "The Abyss" (Aug. 3), a \$50 million underwater thriller; "Lock Up" (Aug. 4) starring Sylvester Stallone; "Parenthood" (Aug. 2) with Steve Martin.

"We have a lot of good pictures yet to go in the summer," Krier said.

The biggest hit of the summer will unquestionably be "Batman," which had a record-breaking opening (\$42 million) and should top \$200 million by the end of the weekend. Still, a number of other pictures attracted huge audiences.

Three of the top five summer box office leaders are sequels, demonstrating that the public's appetite for big action, big-budget series has not diminished. "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade," No. 3 in that series, broke opening weekend box office records and now has \$172 million in the till. The "Indiana Jones" opening weekend record stood until "Ghostbusters II" opened (the film has grossed \$98.5 million) and set a new record that lasted just one week before the

smash opening of "Batman." "Lethal Weapon 2" did not threaten the "Batman" opening numbers; but it has done \$71.6 million of box office business in three weeks and will soon pass "Ghostbusters II" as the summer's third biggest hit.

There were a few clunkers this summer, at least, measured against expectations.

Two of the biggest ones were sequels, proving that using tried-and-true formulas was not a guarantee of success this summer and suggesting that some story lines may have run their course. The latest James Bond installment "Licence to Kill" has made \$18 million since opening July 14, far less than was expected. "Karate Kid III," like "Star Trek V," opened strongly, then faded fast. "Karate Kid III" has grossed just \$31 million. "Star Trek V," which is almost played out, has taken in \$48.2 million.


"It's serendipity that so many major films arrived at one time," said Art Murphy, box office analyst for Daily Variety, referring to the summer's blockbusters.

Serendipity seems to have also played a part in the selections of moviegoers—Disney's "Honey, I Shrank the Kids" and "Dead Poets Society" emerged as unlikely hits in an otherwise action-film dominated summer.

"Honey, I Shrank the Kids" shattered all Disney studio records on its opening weekend, grossing \$14.3 million, eclipsing last year's hot "Who Framed Roger Rabbit," and easily knocking heavy-hitters "Ghostbusters II" and "Indiana Jones" at the top of the chart, trailing only "Batman." "Honey" has grossed \$87 million so far.

"Dead Poets Society," opened strongly and held on among the leaders through much of June and July. It has grossed \$70 million so far.

Summer movies are usually calculated to showcase the studio's best offerings because summer moviegoing accounts for 40 percent of yearly ticket sales, Murphy said. Released at a time when adults are on vacation and children are out of school, summer films are traditionally lighter fare.

'Licence to Kill' offers a darker version of James Bond

HOLLYWOOD — Time marches, age withers and everything falls into decay... except James Bond, still spruce and deadlier after all these years.

The series has been around since 1962 and, like many another old-timer, tends to repeat itself. Yet, every once in a while, it pulls in its stomach, pops the gun from its

cummerbund, arches its eyebrow and gets off another bull-eye. The newest, 'Licence to Kill,' is probably

one of the five or six best of Bond. At first, it is hard to suggest why. 'Licence' (the title is deliberately anglicized) milks the formula as before: a mix of sex, violence and exotic scenery, with Bond on a one-man raid against an archetype of evil, while seducing women and taking in sights. Here, the locales include the sea-spray expanses of Key West and the garish palaces of Mexico City disguised as a fictitious 'Isthmus City.'

Yet the overall tone has gotten more burnished, sadder. The new movie sends the new Bond, Timothy Dalton, on a desperate one-man vendetta against an apparently omnipotent South American cocaine czar. And it isolates him, kills or maims three of his best friends, strips him of his rank, his government, his very license to kill. It leaves him with almost nothing but his wits — and dear old chieftains expert Q (Desmond Llewellyn), who pops up ex officio with another bag of lethal cameras and exploding toilet accessories.

It even strips away a little libido. As Timothy Dalton plays the role — with wolfishly sad eyes — this is a more wounded and sensitive Bond than we have ever seen, the sort of Bond the late Laurence Olivier might have imagined (The look is there, but not the lines). Bond's appetite for sex seems more distracted, tentative. His women — Carey Lowell as a helicopter pilot and double agent, Talisa Soto as the drug czar's faithless mistress — are more self-sufficient. His armor has sprung a leak.

It is not a film about an urbane adventurer, moving with serene confidence through a violent, chaotic world. It is a film about a bereaved friend, half-crazed with grief, relying on his instincts and professionalism to carry him through a situation rotten with peril. Like Stallone's Rambo or Eastwood's Dirty Harry, this Bond has been stiffed by the world and abandoned by his government. He is a loner, driven by overwhelming personal hurts — confronted with a cool, sexy

foe who, in some curious way, almost recalls the old Bond. Previous villains in the series tended to be older, more urbane, wicker-paterfamilias figures. Instead, Robert Davi, a heavy in 'Die Hard,' makes Franz Sanchez — who is modeled on modern drug kings like Carlos Lehder of Colombia's Medellin cartel — a sexy adventurer who melts out rough justice with style and merciless sarcasm. And he has a code: Loyalty matters to him more than money.

It seems to isolate Bond as well as Sanchez. Yet it leaves him with everything that counts: the gimmicks, the archetypes, the formulas, the old jokes of a full 27-year and 16-film tour of duty. Like all Bond movies it has its set-pieces, chief among them a roaring, rousing Mad Max-style climactic, exploding chase involving three Kenworth trucks, Jeeps and a small plane set on a desolately beautiful Mexican mountain road. It is planned and staged with the exquisite carnage of a silent comedy car chase, with gags topping gags, and surprises leaping over each other — just as one flaming truck leaps over the plane.

1982's 'Dr. No,' directed and co-written by new veterans John Glen and Michael G. Wilson, the movie whips up a combustible brew of old and new.

Is it just updating the new clichés: the incessant car crashes, gruesome sadism, heavy hardware, feistier heroines? (Just as there used to be obligatory sexpals-in-distress, Carey Lowell almost seems an obligatory lone wolf.) Perhaps — but all those movies stole from the Bond films, too, often draining out the crucial elements that make them fun: self-kidding humor and exotic locales.

'Licence to Kill' (MPAA-rated PG-13, despite extreme violence and suggestions of sex) has the usual bursts of logic, the gratuitous sex and violence. But gratuitous sex or violence have always been fixtures of Bond's world. Often the formulas grate on you. Here, they ignite. This is a gull-edged Bond; there is a core of darkness and pain in the glittery world exploding around it.

Robin Williams shines in 'Dead Poets Society'

The following are capsule reviews and a parental rating guide of some of the films now playing in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and the Los Angeles Times reviewers.

THE DEAD POETS SOCIETY (PG). Against the glacially perfect backdrop of a 1959 East Coast prep school, which director Peter Weir turns into an evil ice palace, star Robin Williams blazes like a poetry-spewing, stand-up comet: He is playing a rebel English teacher, whose motto is "Seize the day!" and who gets his students to drink a little too deeply from the Pterian Spring. Tom Schulman's brave, off-beat script has overly melodramatic twists, but it is a heartwarming dry pyre against conformism's brutalities and a moving elegy for every inspired teacher, who made knowledge live. And, right now,

Williams may be the most exciting performer in American movies. **GHOSTBUSTERS II (PG).** It is slimebusting time again and The Boys are back in ferocious form. One-line zingers ricochet around "Ghostbusters II" like ectoplasmic ghoules, contained in a production that builds to a grand finale even funnier than the guys' classic duel with the Stay-Puft Marshmallow Man. Over on the hardware side, this is one of those times when the Industrial Light and Magic crew succeeded totally.

HONEY, I SHRUNK THE KIDS (PG). Shrunken suburban kids, accidentally tosed out with the trash by their mad scientist daddy, try to fight their way back home through a yard turned into a jungle of monstrous bees and towering foliage. What happens to them is

what happens to the movie: the humans shrivel into crawling pillies or overwielding robots and the grass and the insects and giant cookies take over. It is a special effects marvel, no doubt — but the verbal jokes have the comic timing of a mating dance by blind elephants. **INDIANA JONES AND THE LAST CRUSADE (PG-13).** We are told that this is our last romp with of Indiana. It follows a headlong race for the Holy Grail, the lifelong obsession of Indy's estranged medievalist-father portrayed by Sean Connery. Both Harrison Ford and Connery play their "I never told him I loved him" moments full-out and unabashedly, and they alternate them with good, acerbic, air-clearing bits of accusation and grousing. But Spielberg plunges into some scenes with such a perfunctory set-up that he catches his audience unprepared. It may be in the spirit of the hero-myth, but you can't blame audiences

for wondering where the harm would be in one splendid partner to accompany the lads into the sunset, a sort of Lauren Hutton. **BATMAN (PG-13).** When millionaire Bruce Wayne puts on his Bathat, his Batgoggles and his world heavyweights' Batsuit, almost nothing is left of him but glitteringly blue-gray eyes and a voluptuously full mouth. If a costume alone could stop crime, this one would, because it almost stops Michael Keaton. In the opposite corner, wearing purple satin, clown white, green hair and a permanent rictus, is Jack Nicholson as the Joker. It is his energy that keeps the picture alive; it is certainly not the special effects, the editing, or the flaccid screenplay.

Grandma dislikes home-study course

Dear Abby

DEAR ABBY: Please help me. My daughter has taken her children out of public school to teach them herself. I called the Board of Education, and they told it is legal to use a home-study course for children.

Abby, my daughter didn't graduate from high school herself. She was very headstrong and refused to attend classes, so when she was old enough to quit school, she quit.

Her children are 7, 8 and 12 years old, and they've all had difficulties with their studies. The 7-year-old is repeating first grade next year, the 8-year-old has just completed two years in the first grade, and the 12-year-old will have to repeat the fifth grade.

This home-study course requires only 4 1/2 hours of schooling per day, and I doubt if the children will get the education they need in this little time. Also, my daughter is no teacher.

She says she wants her children to have a good Christian education, free from drugs and the bad influence of classmates whose upbringing she considers inferior to

her children's.

I told her that I do not approve of isolating her children in this manner, but she insists that I don't know what I am talking about. Please give me your opinion for the sake of these children.

— WORRIED

DEAR WORRIED: Some home-study programs have worked very well; others have not. It depends upon the competence of the teacher. (It's usually the mother.)

In view of the problems your grandchildren have encountered thus far in school, I suggest that they be tested for reading (and learning) disabilities — regardless of whether they are taught at home or in a public school.

DEAR ABBY: Our daughter was born with a cleft palate (hardlip). At

4 months of age, this birth defect was corrected beautifully with surgery. She's now 2 1/2 years old and the thin scar under her nose is barely noticeable.

Before her surgery, I look pictures of her and was not ashamed of her defect. I thought she was just as beautiful as my other children. The other day we were looking through the family album, and my husband said he thought we should put away the pictures of our daughter before she had her surgery. I don't see anything wrong with showing our daughter, and others, those pictures. What do you think, Abby? Would parents who have had children with facial abnormalities that were later corrected please respond? Better yet, any readers who were children who saw their "before and after" pictures, please respond.

DEAR MOM: I would put those pictures away until your daughter is old enough to make that decision herself. You had the abnormality corrected because you didn't want her to be "different"; since it was

corrected and no longer exists, I see no point in immortalizing it in a family album. Readers?

DEAR ABBY: I am a senior citizen. Several years ago, I made arrangements with my bank for a safe deposit box to be jointly shared with my son. All the paperwork completed, I never gave it a second thought. I have had an account with that bank for 43 years.

Yesterday when my son went to the bank to remove an item from our safe deposit box, he learned that he did not have access to it! The card with his signature on it was not on file. Fortunately he discovered this yesterday, phoned me immediately and it was straightened out. (Misfiling his card was an error on the part of the bank.)

Abby, I am writing this to suggest that everyone who has a safe deposit box pay a test visit to the bank to ensure that he or she has access to it. Thanks for all the years of enjoyable and helpful reading.

U.S., Japan OK a DAT standard

TOKYO (AP) — Record companies and electronics manufacturers have reached an agreement over sales of digital audio tape recorders, opening the way for widespread marketing of the machines, industry sources said.

Digital audio tape (DAT) equipment uses the same digital technology employed by compact disc players, resulting in recordings that are close to perfect. Record companies have opposed the recorders out of fears they could be used to make high-quality copies of CDs and damage their sales.

The agreement, which specifies a condition of anonymity, said U.S. European and Japanese record and electronics industry groups had agreed on an international standard that would allow sales of DAT recorders that can make direct digital recordings once from digital sources such as CDs.

The DAT machines would automatically prevent further copies of the recordings, industry sources said. DAT machines are now being sold in Japan and Europe. But the equipment on the market cannot make direct digital recordings from CDs. They must convert the digital signals first into analog mode and then reconvert them to digital.

Donaldson, Sawyer bring expertise to 'PrimeTime Live' newsmagazine

In the weird world of television ratings, prime-time news shows aren't as big a gamble as one might think. Sure, some have come and gone, like NBC's "First Tuesday," or ABC's "Our World." But CBS's "60 Minutes" has been one of the most popular shows on Sunday night for ages. And ABC's "20/20" has managed to succeed no matter what its day or time slot.

ABC's newest entry in the newsmagazine arena is as close to a surefire winner as a network could dream up. They already had one element in place — ace White House correspondent Sam Donaldson. Then ABC lured one of CBS's biggest news stars into the fold. They promised Diane Sawyer the moon and the stars (and big bucks), and they got her. And now ABC debuts "PrimeTime Live" on Thursday, Aug. 3.

Sawyer and Donaldson are two of the most respected names in television journalism. They also have two of the most dissimilar reporting styles, which should make things quite interesting.

Sawyer's cool persona and drop-dead good looks could have taken her anywhere. But she didn't obtain her

present lofty heights by appearance alone. She is known in the industry as a tough, insightful reporter.

Her entree into the national news scene was working in the White House press office of President Nixon from 1970-74. When the president resigned, she remained on his staff, assisting him in compiling his memoirs. She joined CBS as a reporter in its Washington, D.C., bureau in 1978 and quickly became a correspondent. She covered the Democratic and Republican primaries and conventions in 1980.

She went on to co-anchor the "CBS Morning News," first with Charles Kuralt, then with Bill Kurtis. In 1984, she won a spot on the popular "60 Minutes," where she remained until jumping ship to ABC.

Donaldson is perhaps known best as the burr under President Reagan's saddle. Always a tough questioner, Donaldson doesn't mince words, especially when covering the president. (One lingering image is Donaldson shouting out virtually unanswerable questions to President Reagan boarding his helicopter.)

As chief White House correspondent for ABC since 1977, Donaldson has dogged both Presidents Carter and Reagan. Consequently many

viewers are of the opinion that "either you like him or you don't." However, he is almost universally respected by his peers. In 1985, the Washington Journalism Review named him the best White House correspondent in the business. The same publication named him best TV correspondent in 1986, 1987 and 1988. Donaldson is also a regular on "This Week With David Brinkley."

Donaldson has covered every national political convention since 1964 and the presidential campaigns of Sen. Barry Goldwater (1964), Sen. Eugene McCarthy (1968), Sen. Hubert Humphrey (1972), Gov. and President Jimmy Carter (1976, 1980), President Ronald Reagan (1984) and Gov. Michael Dukakis (1988).

As co-anchors on "PrimeTime Live," Sawyer and Donaldson should complement each other intriguingly. Their commentary on the big stories of the week may show that oil and vinegar can mix.

Kim Novak's beauty still bewitching

Q: Isn't it true that Kim Novak, who was so great in those Alfred Hitchcock movies, has joined a weird West Coast witchcraft cult? —J.Q.

A: You're confusing life with movie art. Kim played a fetchingly benign witch who snared rich publisher Jimmy Stewart in the movie "Bell, Book and Candle." Soap opera scene

'All My Children' basks in approval

There are no more dedicated devotees than soap opera fans. They are devoted to their stories, as some of them call the daytime serials. They tune in their favorites and follow the travails of the beleaguered heroes and heroines and hiss at the machinations of the arch villains, day after day, year after year.

Soaps are even generational traditions in some families. One viewer recalls her grandmother and mother watching "Guiding Light" and now she is tuning in the CBS soap while taking care of her new-born twins. If "Guiding Light" lasts another 15 years or so, those twins may be rushing home from school in order to tune in, too. That would make four generations of "Guiding Light" viewers in one family. No other form in the entertainment business can make such a claim.

I recently took an informal survey, totally unscientific, to see what the soap fans are watching and why. A school teacher friend of mine, who has 75 students in her media classes, helped in this endeavor.

The results are surprising, to say the least. There are many young men who were familiar with one or two of the soaps and they admitted that they watched them whenever they could. The bulk of the viewers were the young women in the classes. They were fans and they knew the plotlines better than some of us who write about the soaps.

The favorite soap, hands down, was ABC's "All My Children." The young viewers felt the show was always well paced and the storylines were never stretched out beyond their natural conclusion, with very few exceptions. Susan Lucci's Erica was very, very popular. They liked to see Erica get

the upper hand in her involvements. Although Erica could be labeled willful and selfish, these negative characteristics don't seem to stand in the way of her popularity. The message that Erica is sending out loud and clear is not unlike the one that sustained Scarlett O'Hara in "Gone With the Wind" — "tomorrow is another day."

The current storyline concerning Angle and Cliff, an interracial romance, is particularly popular with the fans. The young women felt that Cliff is going to be good for Angle, who has had her share of tragedy in the past. They also were very verbal about the positive message that this romance has sent out, that people are people and emotions should not be ruled by racial or religious differences. The students would be very upset if they knew then what has come to light since they were surveyed. Cliff and Angle's romance is not set for a happy ending, at least not in the storybook fashion the viewers thought. It has been reported that Peter Bergman, who plays Cliff, will be leaving the show. The news came as a surprise to the actor, according to reports. The plot, as best as we can determine, will have Cliff leaving with his first love, Nina, who returns in early August to stir things up. Fans of the soap will recall that Nina and Cliff were married no less than three times in the past, so is number four far behind? The Angle-Cliff affair will probably be resolved sometime in late September or early October, which is the time set for the Angle-Cliff nuptials.

The surveyed young viewers are not representative of the general reaction to the Angle-Cliff romance. According to insiders, the interracial romance didn't go over too well with the general public and that may be the real reason Angle and Cliff won't live happily ever after.

In any case, "All My Children" gets a big nod of approval from a group of young viewers.

CHANNEL CHATTER

TV crusader Terry Rakolta continues battle for more responsible networks

LOS ANGELES — What Terry Rakolta doesn't know might not hurt her.

The Detroit mother who drew national attention when her letters to sponsors about the sexual content of Fox's "Married, With Children" drew serious response spoke here on a panel about the issues of censorship and standards.

Though she has learned much in her four months in the spotlight and can rattle off statistics and studies about the reach and effect of television, she still shows a lack of knowledge of many of its workings.

She does not, for instance, seem to understand the difference between a network and a syndicated program. In driving for a return to the "family hour" concept between 7 and 9 p.m., she doesn't realize that local stations program the 7 to 8 o'clock hour with whatever they can buy, while the networks are responsible for the 8 to 9 p.m. slot.

She voiced specific objections to network shows, to an afternoon syndicated talk show, and to a promo run by local stations in the middle of network shows apparently without realizing that the responsibility for each lies with a different party. She did not appear to know that a station that she can receive in Detroit comes from Canada.

In interviews and on the panel (which was sponsored by the Television Critics Association and the Center for Population Options, a group concerned about teen-age pregnancies and the effect of media images on that problem), Rakolta made clear that her view was that if it was run on the network affiliate, it must be a network program — which is, of course, not the case.

But in many ways, this very naivete is Rakolta's strength. It makes her come across not as some slick, scheming leader of a special interest pressure group, but as simply a mother of three young children — 8, 9, and 10 years old — who can't

believe what they are exposed to on television.

As Rakolta told her story, "Married, With Children" was just the straw that broke the camel's back.

"If I had known I was going to get all this national attention, I would have focused on violence instead of sex," she said. "I think that's a worse problem."

Rakolta said that a few days before the "Married, With Children" episode set her off on her crusade, she came home and her 8-year-old daughter was upset and asked if women had sex with dogs, something she had heard on Oprah Winfrey's talk show.

"I hadn't even talked to her about sex with people yet, so I didn't know how to handle this," she said. "I took a good look at our big Labrador downstairs."

Then, on a Sunday night, she gathered her family to watch what she thought from the title was a family program, "Married, With Children." When the plot took the cast to Frederick's of Hollywood and one woman, back to the camera, took off her bra and asked strangers, "How do I look?" Rakolta sent her kids out of the room.

"This sort of stuff used to be considered soft porn," she said. "I kept watching because I wanted to know who sponsored this program. I thought it was going to be truck driving schools and muffler shops; things like that. I couldn't believe it when I saw Coca-Cola and Pamprin, which is made by Johnson and Johnson."

"These are big corporations and corporate America is always saying it is the friend of the family and then it is sponsoring something like this at 8:30 on Sunday night."

Rakolta made phone calls to the local station, to Fox, and finally to the production company where a producer essentially told her to mind her own business. It was then that she started writing advertisers, and started to get Fox's — and eventually the nation's — attention.

"I have become less strident than I

was at the beginning," Rakolta said. She also showed that she had learned a few things. For instance, in an appearance on ABC's "Nightline" program, she had attacked the amount of sex on "thirtysomething," whose co-creator Marshall Herskovitz was also on the show.

But, with Herskovitz on this panel, and with "thirtysomething" a favorite of many of the critics in the audience, she said that the sensitive handling of sex on that show was appropriate in its 10 p.m. time slot.

For his part, Herskovitz said that he did not question the right of viewers like Rakolta to write to advertisers, but that he thought they might be writing about the wrong subject, pointing out that advertisements sometimes contain the most exploitative and destructive images seen on TV.

"Thirtysomething" exists because it sells products," he said. "The minute it stops selling products, it's off the air. To me, that's a very frightening and upsetting thought."

A representative of the advertising community, Sandy Inbody-Brick, who runs her own agency and is chairman of the western region of the American Advertising Federation, said that advertisers were merely seeking to put their products before the appropriate demographic groups and that they were at the mercy of the networks as to the content and standard of the programs.

"It used to be that TV was a guest storyteller in your home and as a guest it shouldn't offend the host, bother the children or upset the horses. Now they're telling us that it's still a guest, but if it gets too rowdy, you should throw it out. Well, I didn't buy a TV to turn it off."

But that is exactly what Rakolta said she has done in her house, though the other night when she turned it on to show her kids "The Diary of Anne Frank," all they remembered was a promo for a tabloid show that promised to let you hear the tape-recorded dying words of a murdered 7-year-old.

NBC's News president Gartner faces some tough questions from his critics

LOS ANGELES — It's a bit ironic that Michael Gartner, author of the nationally syndicated "Words" column, has been a man of such few words in his role as president of NBC News.

Of course, part of the reason the 50-year-old former newspaperman, who took over the top spot at NBC News last August, has had so little to say to TV critics is that so much of the news surrounding his organization has been bad.

Earlier this year, for example, an internal memo in which "Today" show host Bryant Gumbel ripped weatherman Willard Scott became public, causing great embarrassment to all concerned. So much so, in fact, that the little Gumbel-Scott passion play had to be resolved on the program.

And then there was the loss of star anchor Connie Chung, who jumped ship and went to CBS News. NBC News grabbed former Cable News Network anchor Mary Alice Williams. But no sooner had Williams walked in the door than reports sprang up that she was unhappy at the network and wanted to go back to CNN. (Williams angrily denied the reports after an appearance here.)

And let's not forget, as well, that the "NBC Nightly

News With Tom Brokaw" continues to be third — though not by much — in the evening news ratings race.

No wonder the right words seemed to escape the professorial, dry-witted Gartner when he met with TV writers the other day during NBC's portion of the July press tour.

That was particularly apparent when Gartner explained his reasons for giving Dick Ebersol, the new president of NBC Sports, the additional title and duties of senior vice president of NBC News in charge of the "Today" show. As far as the press was concerned, Gartner's motivation for making the change was, in a word, unclear — especially because "Today" has been No. 1 in the morning for four years.

Gartner kiddingly talked about needing a new gin rummy partner but was serious when he said that the appointment occurred after he and Ebersol "went out to lunch and developed a pretty good friendship."

Giving Ebersol the new job, "just seemed so natural," said Gartner.

The reaction of the press to that news and many other statements from Gartner and NBC News staffers was, in another word, doubting. Clearly Gartner, who announced that four to six sports specials would be produced in 1990 under the NBC News banner, wants the

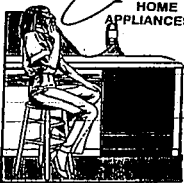

But putting Ebersol in charge of the "Today" show didn't seem to be the neatest fit with Gartner's contention that "I'm about 80 percent of the way there now toward having a news-driven, rather than a program-driven, division." (Translation: We're more news than entertainment.) Ebersol's reputation at NBC has largely been made on the entertainment side as co-creator of "Saturday Night Live" and producer of such shows as "Friday Night Videos" and "Saturday Night's Main Event." He is also executive producer of "Later with Bob Costas."

And there were some unwelcome, managerial buzz words that Gartner used assessing his performance.

"I think that since I came to NBC a year ago, I've really accomplished four things," Gartner explained. "I've restructured and reorganized and streamlined the management of NBC. I've redeployed money into news-gathering, into hiring

correspondents and producers and away from the ancillary operations. I've instituted strategic planning."

Such pronouncements are not exactly music to the ears of news purists. Gartner, however, contended, "I don't think you can be successful journalistically unless you're successful financially. My mandate when I came was to get NBC News to a break-even situation, not that it be a big moneymaker."

By the time the anchor team for "Yesterday, Today & Tomorrow" got up to talk about their new prime-time news show, the operative word was "unfortunate." The show will be seen Aug. 2 and 23 and Sept. 13 from 10 to 11 p.m. before moving to a full-time berth sometime in 1990.

Anchors Maria Shriver, Mary Alice Williams and Chuck Scarborough were not able to explain away doubts that the show would indeed be news-driven. Especially because it promises to "combine the reputation and resources of NBC News with the dramatic, visual appeal of the motion picture form."
