Fire bosses across West keep eye on weather

Firefighters raced Thursday to take advantage of cool weather that slowed the march of wildfires in Idaho and Oregon, worried that climbing temperatures could bring a weekend of increased destruction. Cool, moist weather helped the fire-fighting efforts in Idaho and eastern Oregon, with overnight temperatures below freezing in Idaho's Boise and Payette National Forests. But the forecast was for rising temperatures through the weekend. "Obviously we would very happy if the weather stayed the same," said fire center spokesman Arnold Hartigan. Higher temperatures and low humidity are going to complicate matters for firefighters. In Idaho, where the fires have blackened 98,000 acres, firefighters and National Guardsmen struggled to back containment lines around fires in the western and central parts of the state. National Guardsmen helped firefighters cut lines around the fires and protect scattered buildings in the Boise and Payette national forests. In Oregon, Army infantry troops joined the fight Thursday against fires that have burned 68,000 acres of forest east of the Cascades. About 650 soldiers from Fort Lewis, Wash., set up camp Thursday outside Unity, about 70 miles southwest of Baker and three miles from a 18,300-acre fire in the Monument Rock Wilderness. Because machinery is barred from wilderness areas, the soldiers will be assigned to the tedious task of cutting fire lines with hand tools. One more day of "on-the-job" training was planned Friday along relatively safe fire lines already established at the blaze, said U.S. Forest Service spokesman Steve Sorath. A 23,300-acre fire on the boundary of the Eagle Cap Wilderness area northwest of Baker destroyed a small snowmobile hut, but spared the Lick Creek Guard Station, which is on the National Register of Historic Places, said Bruce McMillan, Wallawa-Whitman National Forest spokesman. Fire crews also were able to establish an advance "spike" camp closer to the fire. Officials estimate they will be able to contain the fire by 6 p.m. Saturday, said Lisa Lew with fire information in Stanley. At almost 2,000 acres, the McPhearsion Fire is the largest fire in the Sawtooth National Recreation Area since the 1,800-acre Pala Creek Fire in 1957. Because of light resources, fire officials aren't trying to douse the fire outright, but hope to stop it from moving into bigger timber further down the mountain. Editor's note: Reporter N.S. Nokkentved accompanied firefighters on an unusual equestrian trek this week. He returned Thursday to file this account. BY N. S. NOKKENTVED Times-News writer GRANDJEAN - Armed with shovels, chainsaws and adze-like Pulaski tools, firefighters are the foot soldiers of the woods. But after 24 hours or more on the fire line, the sooty infantrymen need rest, food and water. This week, the Forest Service sent in the cavalry. "Firefighting is essentially the movement of troops into strategic locations," said Ken Britton, a Sawtooth National Recreation Area official.

The Forest Service doesn't often use horses to move its troops and their supplies, but on the McPhearsion Fire in the Sawtooth Wilderness necessity forced it to revert to older methods of transport. With bigger fires elsewhere in Idaho drawing off scarce resources, the Forest Service had to improvise to get firefighters and equipment to the remote wilderness fire. Wednesday afternoon, 19 horses and six mules carrying 14 riders and 40 loaded backpacks trailed out of the base camp at Grandjean through tall ponderosa pines. The firefighters, unused to life in the saddle, were skeptical at first. Though all had been on horseback before, it was the first time any of them had ridden to a forest fire. For Ray Miller, a Pennsylvania resident a

white-faced mare, it was his first time in such wild, open country. Led by wilderness outfitters Darl Allred and Tom and Deb Proctor, the mounted firefighters easily forded the South Fork. A little more than halfway to the camp, the trail rose sharply. Sure-footed horses picked their way along the narrow, rocky trail, snaking in tight switchbacks up across the back of a mountain. After a long, steep climb from the south fork of the Payette River, the horse trail wound along a ridge overlooking the west side of the Sawtooth Range. Three hours and 14 miles from the base camp, the animals arrived, soaked with sweat from the climb, at the advance "spike" camp half a mile north of the McPhearsion Fire in the Sawtooth Wilderness. GAO cable fee study draws fire

The Associated Press WASHINGTON - A congressional study released Thursday said cable television charges have risen 29 percent since federal regulation ended three years ago. Several legislators complained about inadequacies in the report and one called it "virtually useless." The report by the General Accounting Office, an investigative arm of the Congress, was presented to the telecommunications subcommittee of the House Energy and Commerce Committee. "Shortly afterward," Sen. Aron D. Tenn. issued a statement saying the study "is badly flawed and virtually useless to Congress." Gore, who has introduced a Senate bill to reauthorize the cable industry and encourage competition, called the study reports "out of date" and pointed out that the agency had surveyed less than 20 percent of the industry. 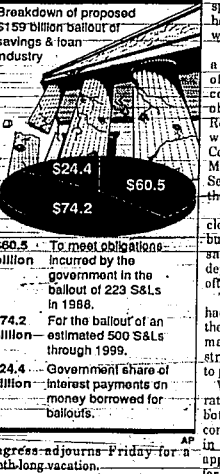

White House, Congress agree on financing S&L bailout plan

The Associated Press WASHINGTON - The Bush administration and congressional negotiators reached agreement Thursday night on financing a sweeping \$159 billion bailout of the savings and loan industry after Senate Republicans torpedooed a Democratic plan. The compromise was reached after a series of fast-paced developments in which President Bush threatened to veto the bill, the Democratic-controlled House ignored him in a 221-199 vote in favor of it and Senate Democrats fell six votes short of mustering the 60 needed to complete action. Treasury Secretary Nicholas F. Brady and White House Budget Director Richard Darman accepted a compromise proposal splitting the cost of the bailout so that only 40 percent of the \$50 billion needed immediately would balloon the federal deficit. The deal calls for the Treasury to borrow \$20 billion this year, raising the estimated deficit from \$149 billion to \$169 billion, but using bonds outside the official deficit to raise the \$30 billion balance next year and the year after. House and Senate negotiators predicted the plan would win passage by wide margins before Congress adjourns Friday for a month-long vacation.

10-year Plan for S & L Bailout



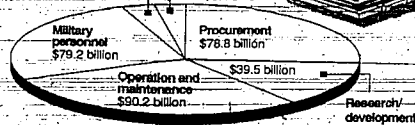
"Obviously we've only had an opportunity to make a quick review, but based on that review in the spirit of which the president sent us here, which was one of compromise, we accept," Brady said. The compromise was approved on a 25-22 vote among House members of a House-Senate conference committee despite vehement objections from Rep. Dan Rostenkowski, chairman of the tax-writing House Ways and Means Committee. Sen. Paul Sarbanes, D-Md., was the only one of the five Senate negotiators to vote against the deal. All of the money would be used to close some 600 insolvent S&Ls - the bulk of them in Texas - and pay off savers whose federally insured deposits were lost through failed an often fraudulent loans. The administration and Congress had reached agreement long ago on the bulk of the legislation directing a massive overhaul of the industry's structure and regulation in an effort to prevent a recurrence of the crisis. With S&L losses mounting at a rate of \$20 billion to \$30 billion a day, both the administration and congressional leaders were adamant in their demands that the fix be approved before Congress recesses for its August vacation.

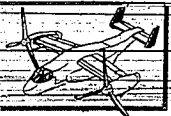

Pay provisions create plenty of controversy

WASHINGTON (AP) — Buried beneath the big-ticket strategic weapons systems in the Senate's military authorization bill are a series of pay provisions that are stirring plenty of controversy on their own.

The Senate overwhelmingly approved a \$295 billion defense package Wednesday that largely endorses President Bush's Star Wars program, the B-2 stealth bomber and intercontinental ballistic missiles.

The measure also allows the Defense and Energy departments to pay 625 scientists and engineers more money than the vice president and gives law enforcement agents the final option of shooting down an aircraft suspected of transporting drugs.

By Thursday, House Republicans and Democrats alike were casting a wary eye on the pay provisions while an association of government executives expressed its outrage. "I don't think the House is willing to increase the pay" of those affected by the legislation, said Rep. William Dickinson of Alabama, ranking Republican on the Armed Services Committee.

Under the provision, the Defense Department could raise the pay of 300 scientists and engineers and the Energy Department could boost the salaries of 25 employees up to 150 percent of the amount they would normally be paid under the current federal pay system.

The 525 employees could end up with \$134,250 per year, more than the vice president, who receives \$110,000

annually, and members of Congress and Cabinet officers, who get \$89,500, early September to craft a final defense blueprint.

The provision's objective is to retain first-class scientists and engineers who might otherwise leave government for the private sector. But in a Congress still hurting from the rancorous debate earlier this year over pay raises for members, the provision seems sure to face a tough road when House and Senate members meet in conference in early September to craft a final defense blueprint.

Unlike the Senate bill, the House version of military spending legislation has no such pay provisions.

The Senate package also allows Defense Secretary Dick Cheney to hire 1,000 retired officers, and the Energy Department 250.

Comparing defense bills

WASHINGTON (AP) — Here, at a glance, is a comparison of the fiscal 1990 defense authorization bills passed by the House and the Senate. The two chambers will meet in conference in early September to craft a final blueprint on \$295 billion in Pentagon spending and \$10 billion for the Energy Department.

STAR WARS

The Senate bill trims \$400 million from President Bush's request of \$4.9 billion for the anti-missile shield. The House slashed \$1.8 billion from the proposal and authorized using the money for "conventional programs, military drug interdiction programs and cleanup of nuclear waste sites."

B-2 STEALTH BOMBER

The Senate made a modest cut of \$300 million in Bush's \$4.7 billion plan and imposed flight test and radar-evasion standards on the program. The House limited production of the bat-winged aircraft

to two planes next year and two the year after — half of what the Bush administration sought — and required the Pentagon to come up with a program cheaper than \$70 billion for the planned 132 planes.

MX RAIL-GARRISON SYSTEM

The Senate endorsed the administration's request of \$1.1 billion for the plan to move the 60 multiple-warhead missiles from their fixed sites to railroad cars. The House slashed \$502 million from the program.

MIDGETMAN

The Senate accepted Bush's plan to spend \$100 million on development of the single-warhead, truck-based missile. The House cut all \$100 million for the Midgetman.

F-14D JET FIGHTER

The Senate endorsed Bush's decision to cancel the carrier aircraft manufactured by Grumman Aerospace Corp., of New York.

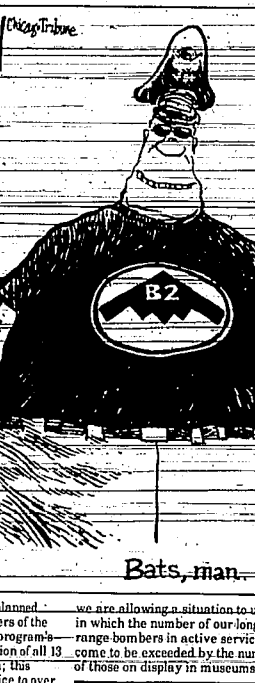

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government said Thursday that its chief economic forecasting gauge declined in June for the fourth time in five months, renewing concerns that the longest economic expansion in peacetime history may be nearing an end.

The Commerce Department's Index of Leading Economic Indicators edged down 0.1 percent in June following a May decline of 1.3 percent. It had been the steepest drop in 19 months.

The leading index still has not flashed the traditional signal of an impending recession, which is three

consecutive monthly declines. Decreases in February, March, May and June were broken up by a 0.6 percent rise in April.

But many economists cautioned that the three-straight rule is not infallible. The steep 1981-82 recession had actually begun before the index recorded its third consecutive decline.

Some analysts said they believed the economy is headed for a downturn, based on the weakness already shown in the leading index and various other business barometers.

The GNP, the country's total

output of goods and services, grew at a lackluster annual rate of 1.7 percent in the just-completed April-June quarter, the slowest growth rate in almost three years.

Economists who believe production will keep expanding in the last half of the year base their optimism on the fact that the Federal Reserve Board switched from driving interest rates higher as a way of fighting inflation to easing credit, starting in June, in order to keep the economy expanding.

In another report showing general weakness, the Labor Department said Thursday that productivity of

American workers edged up a minuscule 0.2 percent in the April-June quarter after having fallen by 1.3 percent in the first three months of the year.

The sluggish growth in productivity, defined as output per hour of work, was accompanied by rising employment costs. Unit labor costs rose at an annual rate of 6.2 percent in the second quarter after an even faster 6.2 percent rate of increase in the second quarter.

Economists said this jump in labor costs meant that inflationary pressures would not abate quickly.

FHA fraud at its worst in Oklahoma

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — To appreciate the immense potential for housing fraud in depressed Oklahoma, one need only to look at the numbers: At one point last year, the state had 1,469 foreclosed FHA homes while New York City had 39 and Boston had one.

Potential turned into reality, and now Oklahoma has "probably the largest FHA fraud in the country," says Charlan Ming, area manager for the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development, which includes FHA.

Some estimates of the Federal Housing Administration loans have approached \$1 billion. A special team of federal investigators has been poring over records and mortgage documents for months, and already more than 20 people have either been convicted, pleaded guilty or agreed to do so.

The possible scope of the situation in Oklahoma was spelled out by Ming, who estimated that fraud may have tainted up to two-thirds of the 5,800 FHA loan defaults over the past 2 1/2 years. Some prospectors were taking in illicit cash from 100 homes each, he said.

Oklahoma's oil-related economic straits provided a calamitous backdrop for illegal schemes. Thousands of homes stand vacant, hundreds more are on the market with no buyers in sight. Along with the high rollers who made hundreds of thousands of dollars, the lure of a few extra dollars also sucked in such people as a retired policeman and an Air Force mechanic.

Board condemns cockpit recording public broadcast

WASHINGTON (AP) — National Transportation Safety Board members on Thursday condemned the public broadcast of a cockpit voice recording from an airliner crash as "lurid entertainment" and a threat to the board's work.

The board voted 5-0 to express regret at an order by a Texas judge that led to release this week of a tape from a Delta Air Lines crash in Dallas last August that killed 14 people.

The board's vote indicated support for Federal Aviation Administration and Air Line Pilots Association calls for a law that would bar release of automatically recorded audio tapes recovered from crash scenes. The board, however, did not propose specific legislation.

The law already prohibits the safety board itself from publicly releasing the 30-minute-long audio tapes which pick up sounds from microphones in airliner cockpits. The board had turned over a copy of the Delta tape to the Texas court as evidence in lawsuits resulting from the crash.

Data appealed to the court not to release the tapes, the judge granted pleas from the plaintiffs and news media for them to be played.

After each crash, the board by law makes a transcript and releases a printed version only of portions relevant to its investigation.

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Bones found in a search of a central Utah area where serial killer Ted Bundy claimed to have buried a Utah victim's body are those of deer or coyotes, the state medical examiner says.

Medical Examiner Todd Grey examined the bones Wednesday and found they were human.

The bones were found during a weekend search in which dozens of Sanpete County deputies scoured 10 sites over a 60-mile area.



Iran's new president faces first day crisis

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — Hashemi Rafsanjani was sworn in Thursday as Iran's president and pledged to continue the 10-year-old Islamic revolution.

But he faced a crisis on his first day in office: the threat of U.S. retaliation over hostages in Lebanon.

At a ceremony in a mosque that was attached to the late Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini's home in north Tehran, Rafsanjani's voice shook with emotion as he promised to follow in the footsteps of the revolutionary patriarch, who died June 3.

"Despite the propaganda coming from the arrogant world powers our people will not accept anything but the continuation of this path, which is the path of Islam and the Koran," he told religious and government leaders a speech carried by Tehran radio.

He did not mention the hostage issue.

Rafsanjani, 64, a middle-ranking cleric from a wealthy pistachio-growing family in southern Iran, captured 94.5 percent of the vote in the July 28 election to become the Islamic republic's fifth head of state.

He will wield considerably more power than his predecessors under constitutional reforms approved by 97 percent of voters in a referendum.

The reforms abolish the post of prime minister, currently held by Hussein Misavi, and allow the president to appoint and fire Cabinet ministers.

But Rafsanjani, said to be eager to improve ties with the West, is being tested almost immediately by the hostage crisis.

Lebanese terrorists, who claimed they hanged U.S. Marine Lt. Col. William R. Higgins this week, threatened to execute another American.

Chemical arms inspections to begin soon

GENEVA (AP) — The Soviet Union has accepted U.S. demands that the superpowers begin inspecting each other's chemical weapons sites before a global ban on the weapons is signed, officials said Thursday.

Moscow's shift was conveyed in a memorandum from Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard Shevardnadze to Secretary of State James A. Baker III when they met in Paris last week.

The United States had been demanding that the inspections begin before a global ban is signed by the 40-nation Geneva Conference on Disarmament.

Moscow previously wanted to allow checks only after the treaty was completed and signed.

The Geneva disarmament conference has been debating a comprehensive convention to ban chemical weapons for more than two decades, but delegates have little hope of getting the draft accord ready in the immediate future.

A Soviet delegate to the Geneva talks said Moscow's change of position was aimed at starting the inspections as soon as possible.

Moscow expects on-site checks to back its official position that it has no more than 60,000 tons of chemical armaments. Some Western analysts have said the Soviet stockpile is more than six times bigger than that.

The Paris meeting, at which the Soviets' decision was relayed, was part of separate superpower talks on chemical weapons.

The United States and Soviet Union, which have the world's biggest poison gas arsenals, say these talks could help the Geneva negotiations.

Hurricane leaves U.S. islands alone

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico (AP) — Hurricane Dean veered away from the U.S. Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico on Thursday, carrying its 85 mph winds farther out to sea and reducing the threat to the Florida coast, forecasters said.

They said the season's second hurricane would probably sweep 150 miles north of Puerto Rico on its way up the Atlantic Ocean.

The National Weather Service issued hurricane warnings for all the islands of the eastern Caribbean, including the Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico, where authorities had begun putting emergency measures into effect.

Bob Sheets, director of the National Hurricane Center in Coral Gables, Fla., said Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands could get some heavy rain and gusting winds, but no real problems.

Taiwan store fire leaves 27 injured

TAIPEI, Taiwan (AP) — Fire swept through a crowded department store in downtown Taipei on Thursday night, and firefighters said some shoppers may have been killed.

The fire broke out shortly before 8 p.m. on the fifth floor of the 10-story Fit Today department store, and initial reports said 27 people were injured, police said.

A firefighter was seriously burned and 26 shoppers were hospitalized for smoke inhalation, they said.

More Jews leave

GENEVA (AP) — Jewish emigration from the Soviet Union continued at more than twice last year's rate in July, with nearly 1,000 arrivals at a Vienna transit center, a resettlement agency said Thursday.

Soviet authorities allowed 3,971 Jews to leave last month, six more than in June, which raised the year's total to 24,193, according to a spokeswoman for the Geneva-based Intergovernmental Committee for Migration.





Council begins probing high court candidates for vacancies

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Judicial Council on Thursday began probing candidates for the two vacancies on the Idaho Supreme Court, showing an interest in their views on the seemingly deep divisions among the court's current members.

All the candidates interviewed during the council's initial session were asked about what the five-member Supreme Court needs as it heads into the 1990s and the value they place on the ability of each court member to work toward consensus decisions while still maintaining their individuality.

The court has earnestly done its work, Appeals Court Judge Donald Burnett told the council. "But as you

know ... the court has become fractionated."

And Franklin County Magistrate Lowell Castleton said the judicial system from trial judges to attorneys sees the need on the court for a "greater sense of consensus, a greater feeling of congeniality."

He said criminal lawyers feel it is almost multiphase—not to appeal a case because of the high rate of lower court reversals by the Supreme Court.

"There's always going to be dissent," Castleton said. "But even in reading some of the opinions, one gets the real feeling that there is a lot of agreement there. I don't know that that needs to be communicated."

The seven-member council, headed by Chief Justice Robert Bakos, will interview all 22 candidates seeking appointment to the vacancies left by the retirement of Justice Robert Huntley and the death of Justice Allan Shepard by the time the sessions and Friday Executive Director Robert Hamlin said the recommendations of two to four nominees for each seat will be submitted to Gov. Cecil Andrus early next week.

The council has received a significant number of public comments on what the high court needs from its new members, although Hamlin declined to characterize them.

Pratt exhausted when officer shot, attorney claims

SANDPOINT (AP) — James Pratt was an exhausted man who wasn't thinking clearly when he shot and killed a federal law officer last winter, contends an attorney hoping to win a life court document filed Wednesday. Bonner County public defender Jonathan Cottrell concludes that the Jan. 12 shootout happened too quickly for Pratt to have sane judgment — particularly since he had been running from authorities for more than 20 hours.

The document was filed in preparation for a Sept. 5 hearing at which prosecution and defense attorneys will argue whether James Pratt, 31, of Indian Hills, Colo., and his 21-year-old brother, Joseph, of Sandpoint, should be executed.

A Kootenai County jury on July 6 convicted the Pratts of first-degree murder in the death of U.S. Forest Service law officer Brent Jacobson, a former resident of Twin Falls. James Pratt fired the two shotgun blasts that killed the federal agent, who had tracked the brothers into the snowy woods near Smith Creek.

"At the time of the offense, (James Pratt) was both physically and mentally impaired," Cottrell wrote. "He was cold, hungry and exhausted."

But prosecutor Phillip Robinson, in a document filed last month, listed 35 circumstances he believes warrant a death sentence. Among them were the Pratts' involvement in a house robbery that started the brothers' ordeal, and the lack of provocation by law officers.

"James Kevin Pratt exhibited express and implied malice," Robinson wrote. "The circumstances demonstrated an abandoned and malignant heart."

Boisean bound over for trial

BOISE (AP) — Zane Jack Fields has been bound over for trial on a charge of first-degree murder for the Feb. 11, 1988, robbery-slaying of Boise gift shop owner Mary Catherine Vanderford.

Facing a possible death sentence if convicted, Fields, a 30-year-old Boise man, is scheduled to be arraigned Monday in 4th District Court.

At a preliminary hearing Wednesday before Magistrate Richard Schmidt, state prisoner Harold Gilchrist said Fields had admitted stabbing Mrs. Vanderford

"in the neck, above the shoulder," and fleeing the Washing Wall Gift Shop with about \$50 in cash.

Vanderford, 69, managed to dial 911 moments after the attack, but died a short time later.

The conversation allegedly took place a few months ago, when both men were inmates at the Idaho Correctional Institution in Orofino. Gilchrist, a convicted burglar and forger now being held in protective custody at the Ada County Jail, said he has known Fields for several years.

Malnourished dogs nursed to health

PLUMMER (AP) — Nearly 60 malnourished dogs found more than a month ago at a rural Benewah County farm have been nursed back to health in animal shelters in Kootenai County and Spokane, Wash.

"They're doing real good right now," said Ellis Ramey, director of the Spokane Humane Society, one of several agencies temporarily taking care of the animals. "They've picked up on fat and they look a lot better."

The dogs, mostly male and husky mixes, were discovered in late June on Leroy Baumgarten's property west of Plummer. The animals were chained on six-foot chains, without proper shelter or sufficient food, officers said.

At a hearing in St. Maries on Monday, Baumgarten was given a 30-day extension to respond to charges of cruelty to animals, said Rodney Thormalhen, sheriff of Benewah County.

Town votes bonds for high school

HORSESHOE BEND (AP) — Voters have revived a dream in Horseshoe Bend by approving a \$1.6 million bond issue to build the town's first high school.

Seventy percent of the 329 voters who cast ballots Tuesday supported the measure, which Superintendent Robert Keller said was an indication of the positive outlook in the town of 650, about 30 miles north of Boise.

Horseshoe Bend high school students have always traveled about 24 miles to either Garden Valley or Emmett for their secondary education, and roads to both towns generally are snow-covered during the winter.

Shoshone man arrested after scuffle with police

SHOSHONE - A 36-year-old man has been charged with trying to kill his common-law wife with a pistol shot to the head after an argument that started in a bar and ended in a wrestling match with policemen in a cramped travel trailer.

The Wednesday night incident started when a man called dispatchers, said his name was Ricky Dean Robinson and that his common-law wife, Tammy Lynn Adams, had shot herself.

When Shoshone Police Chief Charles Cox entered the travel trailer at 9:30 p.m. in the Handy Mart Trailer Court, he found Robinson clad only in red bikini underwear and "making statements like, 'Why did you do this.' Cox testified in court Thursday, Adams' head, turned sideways, was in a pool of blood.

Cox moved Robinson away from Adams. After ambulance personnel arrived, Robinson said, "She's dead, isn't she, she's dead," Cox said. Robinson was standing in a hallway in the small trailer, he said.

Shortly after this, his arm reached to the right and pulled out a loaded .45-caliber pistol, Cox said.

For the next few minutes, or what seemed like hours, Cox said, he negotiated with Robinson. At various points of the conversation, Robinson held the gun to his own head or put the barrel in his mouth.

Finally, after Robinson tore the clip from the gun and threw it away, Cox tackled him, he said.

With other officers, Cox dragged Robinson outside.

"You aren't taking me anywhere," Robinson said, according to Cox, when they were outside. Robinson then fought with

Cancer center contract still up for grabs

TWIN FALLS - A Blackfoot company submitted the lowest construction bid for Magic Valley Regional Medical Center's new Cancer Treatment Center Thursday, but a contract will not be awarded until next week at the earliest, officials said.

Cannon Builders offered to do the job for \$2,625,000, but five of the seven bids submitted were under \$2.7 million.

Submitting the lowest bid does not guarantee a contractor the job, said Jim Slabaugh, project coordinator. Slabaugh will examine the seven bids submitted, all from Boise or Eastern Idaho, and make a recommendation to the hospital's board of directors Monday.

If the board accepts his recommendation, a contract could be awarded Tuesday and construction could begin later this month, Slabaugh said.

Unidentified body found in reservoir

HAILEY - The Blaine County sheriff is seeking help in identifying a dead man found floating in Magic Reservoir Wednesday evening.

A wind surfer discovered the body about 6 p.m. when his craft almost passed over it on the east side of the reservoir near the Baja Magic Resort.

"It's a mystery to us right now who the man is," said Sheriff Walt Felling.

"We haven't received any reports of missing persons in our area," he said. Nor have officials heard a report of a missing person elsewhere that matches the man's description, he said.

The man is described as white, 25 to 30 years old, about 5 feet 11 inches tall and weighing 180 pounds, with reddish-blond hair. He has a four-inch-long scar on his left knee and was found wearing only a pair of green shorts.

Felling estimated the man had been dead for five to 10 days.

There was no apparent sign of violence. Interviews with many people around the reservoir and a search of the area have produced no vehicle or other additional clues, he said.

"We're assuming he drowned," Felling said.

An autopsy was performed Thursday and results should be available today.

The sheriff's department is hoping a relative, neighbor or co-worker will read about the man and come forward to identify him. Anyone who thinks they have information about the man should contact the Blaine County sheriff's office at 788-2271.

In addition, she said, the West Wendell 4-H Club will have a baked food sale at the football field.

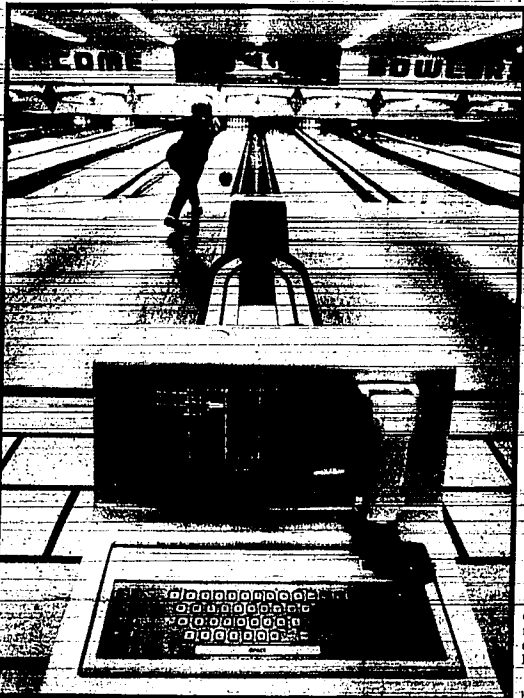
High-tech bowler hits bowling lanes

TWIN FALLS - You still have to roll the ball yourself.

But a high-tech transformation of Miller's Magic Bowl this summer has brought an electronic scorekeeping system that does just about everything else.

"A lot of people didn't want to keep score," said Thelma Tucker, manager of the business at 340 Second Avenue East. "It got by where people would fight over who had to do it. I think this is the answer."



All the scorekeeper has to do now is type the number of bowlers and their names into a computer using a soft-pad keyboard.

The computer counts the number of pins down, computes the scores and displays them in bright colors on a screen above the lane.

But wait. There's more.

There are two screens for each pair of lanes, and both scorecards can be displayed on one screen while bowlers watch television on the other.

And each computer terminal has an intercom that allows bowlers to talk to the front desk or be paged without disturbing bowlers on nearby lanes.

The public will get its first opportunity to test the new scorekeeping system Saturday during Magic Bowl's grand reopening.

In addition to the computers, the entire facility has been remodeled at a cost of over \$250,000, said Paul Miller, who owns the bowling alley with his wife, Jean.

Burgundy and white tiles coupled with grey carpet and mauve counters and seats give a definite "Miami-Vice" look to the place.

The complete facility has taken less than four months, as a team of local carpenters, electricians and family friends converged on the Millers' business in May to finish the renovations during the bowling league off-season.

To install an underground ball-return system, the workers had to cut through seven inches of concrete left over from when the building was a roller rink, Tucker said.

Prices will go up a bit because of the expensive refurbishing, which includes repainting of the sign out front and will eventually extend to the building's exterior, Miller said.

But Miller contends bowling is still the best entertainment value in town.

Rainbows clear out for good

A clean campsite and a few minor incidents are their only traces

JARBIDGE - The Rainbow Family's exodus from its Robinson Hole encampment has left behind a clean campsite - but also a partially unpaid bill and a pattern of semipermanent trails marking the canyon.

"The Rainbow people are gone and they did a real good job of cleaning up," said Tammy Reyer, Jarbridge Ranger District's office manager.

Twin Falls County Sheriff Jim Munn said Rainbow sightings have ceased except for a report that some may be camping in the South Hills and an incident near Salmon Dam - a fight among a small group of Rainbows camped near there.

"As far as we know, they're gone," Munn said. "Of course, inspectors will probably pop up here and there from time to time."

Except for a few culls about Rainbow people sleeping in bushes, Twin Falls police report no further happenings either.

"I think they've pretty well packed up and gone, except maybe for a few at Murphy's Hot Springs and scattered around in the mountains," said Ch Brackett, a Three Creek rancher and the owner of some of the land the Rainbow Family camped on.

Between 5,000 and 8,000 people trekked to northern Nevada a last month for the 16th Annual Gathering of the Tribes World Peace & Healing Celebration, a 60s-style counterculture campout. By two weeks ago, only the clean-up crew remained, pledging not to depart until the Humboldt National Forest site thoroughly tidy.

"By and large I think the Rainbows did a good job of cleaning up," he said.

In fact, he said, the Rainbows left less trash behind than do some 15-person hunting and fishing parties that often invade his property.

Brackett, however, said he ended up hauling away much of the large garbage.

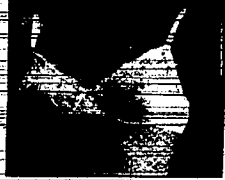

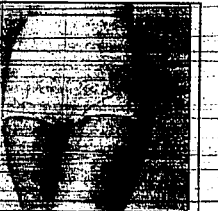

Ladell Andersen weighs his basketball game plan

PROVO, Utah — Ladell Andersen, who abruptly resigned his post as Brigham Young's basketball coach four months ago, says he is weighing several job opportunities.

Andersen, 60, said he might consider coaching overseas, or working as a scout or adviser to a professional team. He also may simply decide to retire, but the former Cougar mentor would not say more than that.

"I might look at an overseas thing. I wouldn't mind seeing things abroad. They are in a learning process over there. If I could go some place where I could really teach, and if they wanted me, I might be interested," he said.

As for a possible post with a professional team, Andersen said, "If I could be of value to somebody, it might work. I've been through it all; I've had my team at BYU. If I could help somebody, I might enjoy it."

Andersen, who coached the Utah Stars of the old ABA and Utah State before taking BYU helm, said Tuesday that retirement is a possibility, but not one he's really given much time to thinking about.

The Andersens have looked at Mesa, Ariz., and St. George, but may stay in their Provo home, if retirement is the choice.

Andersen's contract with BYU expires Sept. 1 and he said he will not be connected with the school after that.

Andersen came to BYU in 1983, where four of his teams went on to play in postseason tournaments.

The Cougars finished the 1987-88 season with a 26-6 record and first place in the Western Athletic Conference. But last season, Andersen's only losing campaign in six years at BYU, the Cougars fell to 14-15 and failed to make a postseason tournament.

Pete Rose reveals his betting habits, motives

Editor's note: This is the first in a two-part series on Pete Rose's gambling.

Pete Rose has testified under oath that he bet on football and basketball games but never on major league baseball. Why would baseball's all-time leading hitter — Charlie Hustle — risk his reputation by betting through an illegal bookmaker?

"It was more of a convenience than anything," Rose, the Cincinnati Reds manager, said in an interview. "I would love, if I bet on Monday Night Football, to be close to Vegas where I could go do it legally. But unfortunately it's too much to pay for an airplane to go there every damn Monday night."

Does Rose believe it was a right and proper thing to do, betting through a bookmaker?

"If I'm not mistaken, there's a lot of money bet through bookmaking," he said. "So I'm not the only one who's doing something wrong."

So betting with an illegal bookie is wrong?

Silence.

Long pause.

"Well, I'd guess I'd have to say it is if it's illegal," Rose said. "You're not supposed to do it."

He was alone with a reporter in a dugout at Cincinnati's Riverfront Stadium, two hours before a recent game. He insisted, as he had for several weeks, that he has never bet on baseball. "Never bet on baseball, never bet on the Cincinnati Reds," he said, looking straight into the reporter's eyes. "And no volumes (of documents) are ever going to prove that I did."

A four-month investigation by baseball's special counsel, John Dawid, concluded that Rose bet on baseball, but on the Reds' offense that carries a lifetime suspension.

Tony Dorsett's injury could spell the end

GREELEY, Colo. — Tony Dorsett of the Denver Broncos, the NFL's No. 2 all-time rusher, was scheduled for further tests on Friday to determine the extent of a knee injury that team officials feared could be career-ending.

Dorsett's left knee gave way while running a pass pattern during a Thursday morning workout in shorts.

The 35-year-old veteran was examined by trainer Steve Antonopoulos and a team orthopedic surgeon. They indicated Dorsett could have suffered ligament or cartilage damage, but were reserving judgment until the running back undergoes a sophisticated magnetic resonance imaging test in Denver.

"It's a little bit vague," Coach Dan Reeves said. "Until we do more tests, we won't know exactly the status of his knee. The knee is pretty stable and that's encouraging. But we do believe there is some damage in there."

"We realize we could be talking about his career, so we're being very careful."

Dorsett, entering his 13th NFL season, had just returned to the practice field on Wednesday after missing several days of work because of a pulled hamstring.

Dorsett gained 793 yards last season in his first year in Denver after being acquired in a trade from the Dallas Cowboys. He had two 100-yard rushing games early in the 1988 season, but played sparingly after that.

Keith Hernandez may have to hang 'em up

NEW YORK — Manager Davey Johnson says injuries to Keith Hernandez the last two seasons may signal the end of the first baseman's career with the New York Mets.

Hernandez, 35, missed two months last season with a pulled hamstring and broke his kneecap in May this year, forcing him out of the lineup for another two months. When Hernandez returned, he bruised his knee sliding at home plate and has missed the last 10 days.

"As much as you hate to think about life without Keith, this is the second year he's been injured and we're paying him a lot of money," Johnson told the New York Daily News.

Hernandez is in the last year of a five-year contract and will earn \$17 million this season.

"It doesn't take a mental giant to see we've got two first basemen right now, and that we're crowded in the infield. And as well as Dave (Magadan) is playing this year, he might've earned himself an everyday job for next year."

Magadan has hit around .300 since taking over for Hernandez.

"A healthy Hernandez, even if he's hitting .280, is more productive than Magadan at .300," Johnson said. "Dave is very selective, even with runners on base. He's not going to give you many RBIs."

The Mets lost their fifth straight in Chicago on Saturday and hope Hernandez might start during a four-game series next Monday.

Hernandez joined the Mets in 1983 in a trade with St. Louis and was a major reason for New York winning 90 or more games from 1984-1988.

Paul Kirk a candidate to head NFL

CHICAGO — Former Democratic National Committee chairman Paul Kirk has emerged as a candidate to succeed retiring NFL commissioner Pete Rozelle.

Kirk was among four candidates interviewed Thursday by the NFL search committee, which started from scratch this week after New Orleans Saints president Jim Finks, the front-runner, failed to receive the votes of 18 others last month.

Finks is still considered the frontrunner and was among the candidates interviewed Thursday.

Kirk, who ran the DNC from 1981 until his retirement earlier this year, practices law in Washington, D.C.

The search committee, co-chaired by owners Lamar Hunt of the Kansas City Chiefs and Wellington Mara of the New York Giants, is in the process of interviewing five candidates to succeed Rozelle.

Finks, the only candidate presented to the owners for consideration last month by the first Search Committee, received only 16 votes, three shy of election. The 11 abstentions in the balloting comprised a dissident faction of owners who felt they were not allowed a role in the search process.

Other interviewed Thursday were Robert Mulcahy, president and chief executive officer of the New Jersey Sports Authority, and Willie Davis, a businessman and former All-Pro end with the Green Bay Packers.

Some of the NFL's newer club owners are pressing for David Stern, commissioner of the National Basketball Association.

Although Stern says he wants to remain with the NBA, several NFL owners have asked the search committee to interview him when it meets again during the week of Aug. 13.

The job pays \$1 million a year.

The argument between the 16 old-guard owners who voted for Finks and the 11 newer owners who didn't has yet to be resolved.

What the new owners still want is a survey of the entire country for what they call the best possible candidate. They say that only Finks, general manager of the New Orleans Saints, could meet two requirements set down by the former committee:

- Knowledge of football.
- Personal experience in negotiating with football players.

"This eliminated the best prospects in America," one owner said. "I knocked out 67 of the 58 names submitted by Heidrick and Struggles (a search firm) — everyone but Jack Kemp."

Members of the new search committee are Hunt, Mara, Al Davis of the Raiders, Mike Lynn of the Minnesota Vikings, John Cooke of the Washington Redskins and Ken Behring of the Seattle Seahawks.

Agassi bows early again from tennis tournament

STRATTON MOUNTAIN, Vt. (AP) — Top-seeded and defending champion Andre Agassi suffered another early exit when he was beaten by first-year pro David Wheaton 1-6, 7-6 (7-3), 6-1 Thursday in the third round of the Volvo International tennis tournament.

Wheaton, a 20-year-old from Minneapolis ranked 122nd, won the biggest match of his brief career and advanced to the quarterfinals.

"It's just awesome that I beat a top 10 player, I'm just sorry it had to be Andre because we're close friends," said Wheaton, who won his first singles title in April at the Brasilia Challenger.

"It just wasn't clicking for me there and that's the key about tennis," said Agassi. "If you get the person to try more than he's capable of, you have him beat. And that's what happened."

Agassi, 19, beat won a title since Livingston, N.J., last year.

No. 2 seed Michael Chang advanced to the quarterfinals with a 6-3, 6-2 win over Derrick Rostagno. Also advancing were Jim Courier, Robert Seguso, Jim Pugh and unseeded Jim Grabb.

Agassi's loss continued a skid that began shortly after he won this tournament last year. The title was one of six he collected in a year that saw his ranking shot from 26 to No. 3.

But this year, he has lost all of the dozen singles tournaments he has entered, although he did beat Ivan Lendl in an exhibition last week in Tokyo.

Agassi took Thursday's loss in stride.

"Every week's a new week, you know. I don't feel bad about getting beat, really. If you give it your best shot and if you don't do it, what can you feel bad about?" he said. "It's a little disappointing but that's about as far as it goes. Next week's another week."

Agassi's loss dashed hopes of a rematch with Courier, who beat him in the third round of the French Open.

Agassi said Wheaton simply played better than him when it counted. Through the second set and especially in the third, Wheaton matched Agassi shot for shot.

"It wasn't luck. He played better. It's a simple as that," Agassi said.

"I kind of snuck out the second set," said Wheaton, who won the tiebreaker on a long passing shot that Agassi questioned. "Then in the third, he just kind of played a sloppy game."

Wheaton, who used to hit with Agassi when the two were younger, said he believed Agassi had trouble trying to rebound.

"You'll be amazed at the talent out there," says Jan Cicic of Talent Haus, who coordinated judging for the event. "We're just

The official starting time for Chalk Walk is 8 a.m. Saturday, but some artists may be starting more elaborate drawings much earlier, even tonight. "They really have to be prepared and plot out what they're going to do," says Cicic.

All drawings must be done by 1 p.m. Awards will be given at 4 p.m. at the fountain downtown.

"It really fills up the downtown, and the drawings are neat to look at," Jenks says. "The drawings will remain at the sidewalks until the next real good rain, and it takes a good rain," he adds.

Four judges will be evaluating this year's entries: Robyn Barnes, a teacher at Twin Arts, will be head judge, assisted by Diane Pearson, also a teacher at Twin Arts; Charlotte Kilfoyle of Kilfoyle Illustration &

Graphics; and Liane Taylor, an award-winning artist from Kimberly.

The free-steel dance slated from 7 p.m. to 11 p.m. is for all ages, according to Peg Venzon, promotions chairman for the Business Improvement District.

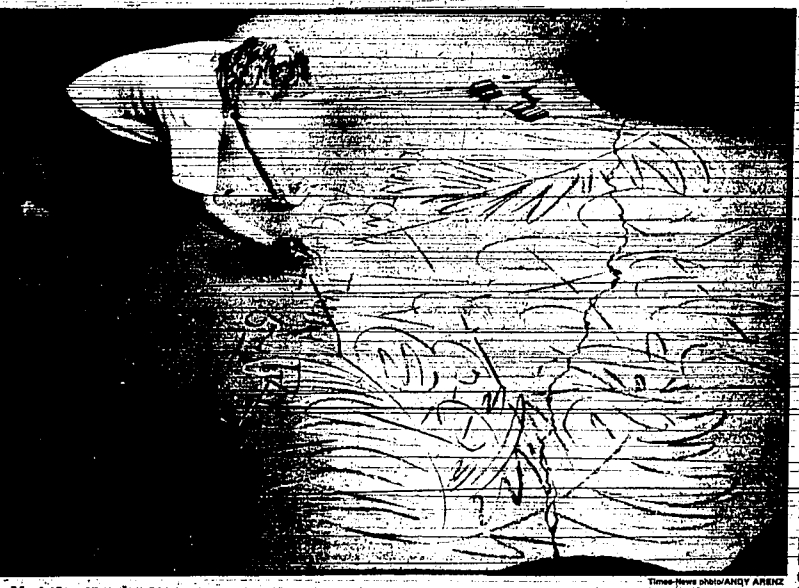

Edward Villella gives his time, talent to ballet

SUN VALLEY — A light breeze ruffles the flap of the canvas door. The morning

sun fills the outdoor room with a subdued brilliance befit for this mountain setting.

The pianist rolls out a lively barrage of notes to which a dozen young dancers leap and point and turn, concentrating, always

watching and listening for the next command, the next step.

"You know how we were talking about swimming backwards," says the lean-but-solid figure to which all eyes are turned. "I'd like to see not the arm, but the WHOLE body," he says as he demonstrates "with a smooth movement which appears to be as simple as simplicity itself."

"You see, I want us to go two directions at the same time," he says with a smile and a gesture which explains it much better than words.

His Edward Villella, claimed to be America's most celebrated male dancer, is honored with the prestigious 1989 Capetio

Dance Award for his work through the years as a vital and athletic ball dancer and his recent creation of The Miami City Ballet Company. Villella has taken residence in Sun Valley for three weeks for a very important reason.

It's a matter of giving something back. That is what has drawn Villella to Sun Valley to teach Summerdance '89 presented by the local Ballet School Foundation. He is joined by another dancer of stature, Christopher d'Amboise.

Those of us who had a certain success owe a debt, Villella says, taking a break beneath the large canvas tent which is



home to the dancers' rehearsal hall and stage.
"I spent my life taking, as a dancer, from the givers who were the teachers, the coaches, the choreographers, the directors and the boards of directors," Villella says. "Once you've enjoyed all that, if you've gotten the best from the best, I think it's embarrassing to walk away from it."
Walk away he does not.
Instead, at the age of 52, after enjoying the limelight of the stage for more than 30 years and learning from many of ballet's greats, such as George Balanchine, Jerome Robbins, and Stanley Williams, Villella is himself one of the greats in the ballet world.
"There's a time to take and a time to give, and my time of taking is over," Villella says in a reflective tone, bouncing back with a renewed gleam in his dark brown eyes as he continues.
"I wish I could dance forever, but I can't because it's a fact for which I have to accept responsibility. I'm plunging myself deeply into the formation of a highly successful ballet company in a highly unlikely place - Miami, Fla.
Villella has brought his skills to Summerdance '89 to help pass on what he terms the classicism of ballet to students who may not otherwise be exposed to some of the new, emerging facets of ballet as an art.
Villella believes it is Balanchine, that dancers are poets and that he tries to relay to the young dancers the importance of maintaining a continuous movement in their steps to create a flow that carries one position into another.
To Villella, ballet is more a mental exercise than physical.
"The mind drives the physical body," he says, "and if you don't have mental understanding you can't really project the physical understanding, it doesn't reflect."
Villella says he now goes to watch ballet with intent of watching somebody's mind.
"I want to see what person is doing, how they've analyzed an approach to their technique, to the artistry, to the style to the musicality. What kind of comment is that artist making, rather than just doing physical things."

These are points he tries to carry across to his students, what he considers to be the generation to continue on with a fresh, new vital force to an art form which is centuries-old.
Christopher d'Amboise takes ballet one step further than most to make ballet a truly contemporary art form. d'Amboise has developed The Off Center Ballet Company in New York City to incorporate his choreography which is unexpectedly set to the music of groups such as Pink Floyd rather than traditional classic music.
Having grown up in a family of great dancers, his father is the ballet master Jacques d'Amboise and his mother dancer Carolyn George. d'Amboise's second home was the theater, giving him a "headstart" introduction to dance.
By the age of nine he performed in "The Nutcracker" and when he was 18 he joined Balanchine's New York City Ballet, becoming a principal dancer in 1984. He was in his early twenties when d'Amboise became the principal dancer in "Tango," choreographed - for him - by Balanchine.
Now at 29, d'Amboise has been successful with other endeavors as well.
In 1983 he took a leave of absence from the world of ballet to perform in several Broadway shows including "On Your Toes" and Joseph Papp's production of "Non Pasquale." He has been in numerous television appearances and also co-starred with Bernadette Peters in "Song and Dance" in 1985 for which he received a Tony Award nomination. He is also author of the book "Leap Year: Intimate Series of Observations on the Life of a Dancer," published in 1982.
Then, after 10 years with the New York City Ballet, he quit. Doing the same thing repeatedly, d'Amboise says he was learning nothing new, so he focused his creative talents on choreographing for his dance company.
"Now I'm making my own way, which I think is important, in order to find my own theory, my own discovery," d'Amboise says.
"The best compliment I can get from people is when they say 'I've never seen anything like it, it doesn't look like anyone else's choreography.' That's the best

because then I know I'm doing my own thing."
As the choreographer in residence for Summerdance '89, d'Amboise is producing a ballet to celebrate Idaho's Centennial. The ballet is a contemporary tribute to the state's mining heritage.
After researching the state's history, d'Amboise decided upon this theme, using a present day ghost town setting complete with real ghosts. The local students participating in the workshops will be the wind, d'Amboise says, and the other professional dancers included in the ballet will tell the story through gesture, music and movement.
Having been at the first Summerdance festival held last year, d'Amboise plans to make Sun Valley his first priority for engagements for several reasons.
He likes the beauty of the area, the professionalism of the staff, and the natural lighting of performing outdoors in the tent. Plus there are the people of Sun Valley, which he says are sophisticated by the fact they are appreciative of the kind of talent Summerdance offers.
And d'Amboise sees Sun Valley evolving, much as Aspen has, to be known for its skiing in the winter and its arts in the summer. Bringing professional ballet to Idaho can only help that goal along.

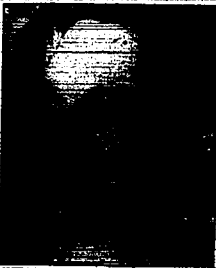

Ron Howard's 'Parent' has wit, nerve and insight

HOLLYWOOD — "The thing about being a parent," snarls Jason Robards' patriarch in "Parenthood," an irascible, near-failure at the job himself, "is that it never, never ends." How many sighs will float through the audience at that moment, validating a sentiment that seems to come from one parent's very corpuses.

Then, because this is a screenplay by the team of Lowell Ganz and Babaloo Mandel ("Spinal Tap," "Night Shift"), Robards adds a kicker to his sentence. It is one of the pungent jabs to the funny bone that sets the movie's tempo, an unrelenting one-two rhythm that eventually overwhelms any demurbers about sticky-sweet patches in the face of this much wit, nerve and insight.

"Parenthood" never does end, of course, and neither does being a son or daughter, which is the beauty of this movie's a-cross-the-board appeal.

HARRY BOORMAN may feel that it is aimed directly at them, with its increasingly funny portrait of a father (Rick Moranis) who is going to see to it that his daughter has a nodding acquaintance with Kalka, square roots and karate, well before she's 4. Parents-of-school-dubbed "hyperactive" or "clenchingly tense" 8- to 10-year-olds will be certain the movie makers were eavesdropping on their last parents' conference.

Those with "impossible" near-haired teen-agers whose every sentence is punctuated by a slammed door, might swear that "Parenthood" was their group portrait. And adult-children of alcoholics (are they the largest growing subculture right now or does it only seem so?) might claim the movie as their own after watching the emotional fallout from Robards' boyish, indifferent attempts at fathering, four decades later.

Doesn't sound like a comedy? Ah, but that is exactly what gives this very real comic delight its backbone.



Director Ron Howard, who also created the film's original story with Ganz and Mandel, uses those bitter-sweet elements like smelling salts; to bring us around after the laughing-gas effect of the jokes.

A family tree may be in order. Robards and a vastly put-upon Eileen Ryan are parents of two sons — Steve Martin and young-black sheep Tom Hule — as well as two daughters — Dinnae Winst, whose husband has left her, and lovely new-comer Horley Kozak, whose husband (Moranis), alas, has not. There are what seem to be 142 assorted children parceled out to these parents, although it may only be seven. And there is Helen Shaw's Grandma, who is actually great-grandma.

Overall Steve Martin's house, we get a heartfelt portrait of a father trying wildly to juggle increased pressure from work and his need to give his three children what he never had, a father figure. Mercifully,

Martin has had the good sense to have married Merry Streiberg, the ballast to his every wild gyration.

Winst, still furious about her ex-husband's abandonment of their two children in favor of his "new" family, is trying to be the cool, unshockable modern mom. It won't be easy. She has to arrange her face around a teen-age daughter (Martha Plimpton) with a live-in boyfriend (Keanu Reeves) who lives only to drag-race, and a young son (Leaf Phoenix) whose video tastes run to the X-rated.

The quibbles come from a couple of points: The almost hysterically pro-parenthood ending, so broad some of the careful-tone is sloshed away. The cheap-shot lines thrown (trouty) to Grandma. The character of Robards' extremely long-suffering wife, but of his every-disparaging remark.

Seems as though she deserves to get a bit of her own back. Finally, is not it time for a moratorium on Rick Moranis' unvarying character, the nerdy lover-husband who, in picture after picture but especially here, attracts perfectly dawning women for a number of seasons: He has become a irritating bit of movie absurdity as Wallace Shawn.

The remaining cast, young, old and in-between, is lovely.

'Licence to Kill' a good Bond

LICENCE TO KILL (R): The best Bond in years but that doesn't mean anti-Bond audiences will be won over. Directors John Glen and writers Richard Maibaum and Michael G. PETER PAN (G): Disney's upbeat, animated adaptation of Sir James Barrie's play remains one of the studio's most colorful and entertaining features. Captain Hook's battles with the Crocodile represent a near-perfect marriage of slapstick animation and a deliciously overstated vocal performance by the late Hans Conried.

BATMAN (PG-13): If a costume alone could stop crime, Batman's would, because it almost stops Michael Keaton. In the opposite corner, wearing purple satin, clo-

white, green hair and a permanent rictus, is Jack Nicholson as the Joker. It is his onργary that keeps the picture alive; it is certainly not the special effects, the editing, or the flaccid screenplay.

'Fatal Attractions' looks at real-life people overcoming their dependency

"Every interview for 'Fatal Addictions' affected me tremendously, one after the other was moving and inspirational," said Maria Shirver, from her Los Angeles office as she worked on the hour-long documentary's final touches. "Fatal Addictions" will air on NBC this Wednesday, August 9.

"Fatal Addictions" explores the similarities all addicts share. When any activity starts to control an individual's life, that person is addicted, explains Shirver. One example in "Fatal Addictions" is a photography buff addicted to buying new equipment. His purchases cluttered up his home so much that he couldn't get into his darkroom.

"Many of these people lead what might be, to the naked eye, a perfectly normal life," says Shirver. To emphasize this normality, no one on "Fatal Addictions" is disguised by being interviewed in a dark shadow. Having acknowledged their addiction, the first big step toward recovery, these addicts are figuratively and literally out of the shadows.

Yet addicts who acknowledge their problems still face daunting statistics. Of those in treatment, one-third will recover, one-third will relapse, and one-third will die. "If I wasn't here,

I'd be dead," is a constant refrain in the interviews. One beautiful moment occurs when a recovering alcoholic and recovering cocaine addict meet. These two people share much joy of sobriety. But any recovery can be thwarted by relapse. Shirver interviews one addict going through rehabilitation for the fifth time.

Recovery was once considered merely a matter of treating the body's physical dependence and developing self-discipline. But "recovery and relapse" addicts stress that the root cause must be addressed. One former addict says, "Getting to the easy part—the hard thing is to figure out 'then what?' after giving up the drug." Cleaning up," explains a drug counselor, "is a sort of maturation process." To avoid a relapse, addicts must develop coping skills to deal with life's everyday problems.

If root causes aren't addressed, an addict might bounce from one addiction to another. Margaux Hemingway tells how she triumphed over alcoholism only to succumb to an eating disorder. And one addict now recovered, recalls that at AA meetings he used to go to the washroom to snort cocaine. "I felt I was there for the

alcohol, so the cocaine wasn't a problem."

"Fatal Addictions" has some weaknesses. The broad inclusiveness creates inconsistencies. Excessive shopping is a problem, but it is seldom a fatal addiction. Movie excerpts detract from the documentary's overall impact. The horrors of bulimia ("My throat was bleeding, but I didn't care. I had to get the food out") are diminished by the theatricality of a clip of Marcellite Horner gorging herself in "Kate's Secret."

Fortunately, these Hollywood intrusions are limited, and "Fatal Addictions" has some excellent, real-life footage. We see a recovering alcoholic in a therapy session with his family, a raid on one crack house, and a tense argument between a counselor and an addict. This provocative documentary should help increase the public's understanding of addiction.

Talk about twists and turns on "The Young and the Restless." Private eye Paul, accused of murdering the impotent George Rawlins, is passionately kissing widow Cassandra. One scene later, Victor Newman is nuzzling Cassandra, telling her how lovely she is.

Newcomer may be lost but not Doug Davidson. Fans know his Paul is innocent despite all the evidence against him. A 10-year show veteran, the former beach boy-model expects producer Bill Bell will save his hide, but that's all Doug knows.

The Paul Williams trial has been delayed. Dad (Carl the detective) and Victor Newman are manipulating Cassandra who acquires a Greek villa for her mystery lover and herself. It looks like the climax is coming in mid-August. Wait, hold on a second! Davidson says Boss Bell has many surprises up his sleeve regarding the Rawlins murder. More suspense is around the corner despite the prevailing third act clues.

In the late '70's, Bill Bell used to run "Young and the Restless" from Chicago and signed the blond, bronzed California beach boy who was fresh from appearing on magazine covers. 'This Old House' gets new host but truth-in-packaging still plagues show

LOS ANGELES — So maybe if the 100 or so critics were just off the plane and happy to be basking in Southern California's obscenely perfect weather, all the questions would have been polite inquiries about the new host of "This Old House" and the plans for the future of the popular weekly PBS half-hour that follows the progress of the restorations of various aging residences.

Maybe.

As it was, the "This Old House" crew hit the stage after the critics had engorged themselves on more than two weeks of network pap and the session turned into one of the more contentious outings during this current tour of the nation's TV press.

As has become the norm in television these days, at the bottom of it all was business.

There was bound to be a bit of controversy about "This Old House." The host of the show since its premiere in 1979, Bob Vila, had turned his position into a well-paying job as a spokesman for various home improvement products and stores.

It seemed like an obvious conflict with a PBS show which, after all, gains much of its credibility from the fact that it is on a non-commercial outlet.

But the originating station, Boston's WGBH, did not blow the whistle on Vila until a couple of months ago when underwriters began dropping out. Vila quit rather than bow to the restrictions.

"Oh boy, do I," Russell Morash, the show's executive producer, said when asked if he wished he had never allowed Vila to begin his commercial career. Morash said that the contract for the show's new host, Stephen Thomas, will have a non-commercial clause.

Morash said that the new host was chosen after hundreds of people came out of the proverbial wood-

work proclaiming themselves per-

fect as Vila's replacement. The 36-year-old Thomas has been on PBS' "Adventure" series — sailing Micronesian outrigger canoes in "The Last Navigator" that aired this summer — and has written a book, "The Wilderness of Ice and Mind," about a sojourn in the Alaskan arctic. He has also restored a number of houses.

Still, the Vila endorsement issue was seen as history and passed with relatively little comment. What really attracted the attention of the critics was a segment of the first show of the new season — Thomas' initial outing — which will air in October.

During the fall, "This Old House" will be following the renovation of a 19th-century barn near Concord, Mass., as it is turned into a residence. It is emphasized in this first show that the owners have a budget restriction of \$250,000 for the job.

It turns out that they are lucky that they signed on with "This Old House." The barn, as is made fairly clear in this first show, has so many problems that it is virtually unsalvageable. To turn it into the residence that these people want ends up costing about \$400,000.

Who pays the difference?

American business, that's who. Manufacturers of kitchens and building materials and such who want to get their products exposed on television donate them to the project. While the fact that materials are donated is disclosed, Morash admitted that their final effect on the bottom line is not always made clear.

What does seem clear is where Vila got the idea that he had a green light to cash in on his position for commercial purposes. That certainly appears to be what "This Old House" is up to, not letting something like a realistic budget stand in the way of a satisfactory conclusion to its weekly home renovation drama; instead handing out plugs in return for donations.

Morash, not surprisingly, didn't see it that way. "There's a distinct

difference," he said. "In one case, an individual is profiting directly; in the other case we are asking manufacturers for their best and most interesting materials that we can get so that our viewers can learn how these things work."

"The reason we get people who want us to do their projects is because they get the job done on an incredibly abridged timetable, they get high quality craftsmanship, the best we can find in the Boston area, and they get the benefit of any donations American manufacturers want on the show.

"We are a fantasy, no question about it," Morash said. "You can't take the effect of television out of the process. We are always asking impossible things to happen and getting them done."

Indeed, it was evident from the segment of first of the new season's episodes that "This Old House" tries to be an entertainment vehicle as much as an informative one. Thomas sets up a good cop-bad cop relationship with Norm Abram, the show's master carpenter. At every turn of their first trip through the barn, Thomas sees possibilities and Abram sees problems. Deadpan comedy is rampant.

Thomas admitted that he overplayed his naivete a bit, but noted that he is no master carpenter. "I did not go through an education process to learn how bad it was," he said.

Morash agreed that most people watch the show not to learn the specifics of renovation work, but to follow an interesting story week to week to its satisfactory conclusion. "I don't consider it a how-to program," Morash said. "We're an explanatory program, an inspirational program, an illuminating program, but I'm troubled by the term how-to."

The problem with "This Old House" is one of truth-in-packaging. It remains an interesting and well-made show that many PBS viewers obviously find satisfactory.

Boxing videos have been a knockout, according to Home Box Office-Video marketing vice president Tracy Dolgin.

"We receive more letters from consumers concerning the boxing tapes than any other videos," he said. "They are currently the most collected genre of video titles."

On Wednesday HBO Video released six more tapes in its "Boxing's Best" series (\$19.99 each), including one covering the career of the late Sugar Ray Robinson. This video biography needed no fancy title. It is simply "Sugar Ray Robinson."

Robinson was the best boxer ever to step into the ring, according to almost every person lucky enough to have

seen him fight. He was so smooth and graceful in the ring that he made great fighters look clumsy by comparison.

His feats are duly recorded in this 60-minute video, even if the old fight films are black and white. A first-rate cassette has been long overdue on this incomparable five-time world middleweight champion who recorded a staggering 176 victories during his 26 years in the ring.

Muhammad Ali said of Robinson in 1965, "He's the greatest fighter there ever was — and that's something for me to say. ... When I started, I copied his moves. When I go into the ring now, he's on my mind. He's always been my idol."

NBC, ABC don't think Congress should legislate TV sex, violence

NEW YORK — House and Senate bills to let the TV industry adopt voluntary guidelines to curb sex, violence and scenes glorifying drug abuse in entertainment shows are not necessary, NBC and ABC officials said Wednesday.

CBS, which in the 1970s had a chief executive who proposed what briefly became the industry's "family viewing hour" at the start of prime time, said that it was not sure such new cable and broadcast guidelines would work.

All three networks said that their own program standards are sufficient guards against excess in their entertainment shows. None said that they opposed the measures, but ABC said that it "won't feel that an antitrust exemption is desirable or

necessary."
 They were commenting on the House's 399-18 approval Tuesday of a bill to give the cable, broadcast and production industries a three-year exemption to the Sherman Antitrust Act that would let them try to develop and adopt their own guidelines for curbing violent programming. The Senate passed unanimously a similar bill in May, with an amendment that also would allow discussions about reducing scenes involving drug use and sex.

The differences will have to be worked out in a House-Senate conference committee in September and then, if approved by Congress, will be sent to President Bush for signing.

The legislation is the result of new waves of complaints about sex and violence on TV and came at a time when the major commercial networks are trying to hold on to

their audience in the face of growing competition from independent stations, video recorders and cable TV — a staple of which is unedited Hollywood movies containing levels of sex, violence and salty language that previously had not been permitted on television.

The National Cable Television Association said Wednesday that it does not oppose the new House and Senate measures, but declined to elaborate.

The Washington-based National Association of Broadcasters, which represents the networks, more than 900 stations and some program producers, took no position on the new measures, although "we still have some First Amendment concerns," said association spokesman John Wolfe. "It's freedom of speech kind of thing. It's

government intrusion here."

But Christopher J. Dunn, counsel for Sen. Paul Simon, D-Ill., author of the Senate measure, said no constitutional issues are involved.

"Part of the reason we're so confident that this bill passes constitutional muster is that neither house is suggesting what guidelines there ought to be. That's left up to the industry."

The measure would permit guidelines to be discussed by officials of the National Association of Broadcasters, the National Cable Television Association, the Motion Picture Producers Association of America, the networks, their

affiliate stations, cable operators, program producers and the Association of Independent Television Stations.

The last group is supporting the new measure, thinking it preferable to have industry self-regulation than government intervention, said Jim Hedlund, the organization's vice president for governmental relations.

However, said Hedlund, whose group says it represents 180 independent stations, including those owned by Fox, his association still seeks broader language in the measure that would avoid a replay of the Lear-Writers Guild lawsuit of 1975.

'Cheers' tops Niensens for week

LOS ANGELES (AP) — NBC's "Cheers" squeaked to a narrow victory over ABC's "Roseanne" as the highest-rated television show in the Nielsen ratings for the week ended July 30.

"Cheers," with a rating of 17.5, came in only one-tenth of a point ahead of "Roseanne." Last week they tied for first place at 17.4.

NBC easily won the week for its 58th straight victory in the A.C. Nielsen Co. survey.

The only surprise in the Top 10 was the appearance of NBC's new summer comedy about nurses, "13

East." It was in 10th place. Other than CBS' "60 Minutes" and "Murder, She Wrote," all the shows in the Top 10 were comedies.

The ratings are certainly proof of the resurgence of the situation comedy, which was all but written off a few years ago. Prime-time soap operas like "Dallas" and "Dynasty" dominated the ratings until the appearance of "The Cosby Show" in 1984. In the 1983-84 season the only comedy in the Top 10 was CBS' "Kate & Allie."

Comedy also dominated the second 10 highest-rated shows.
