Glasnost opens a silo

Americans step inside Soviet launch complex

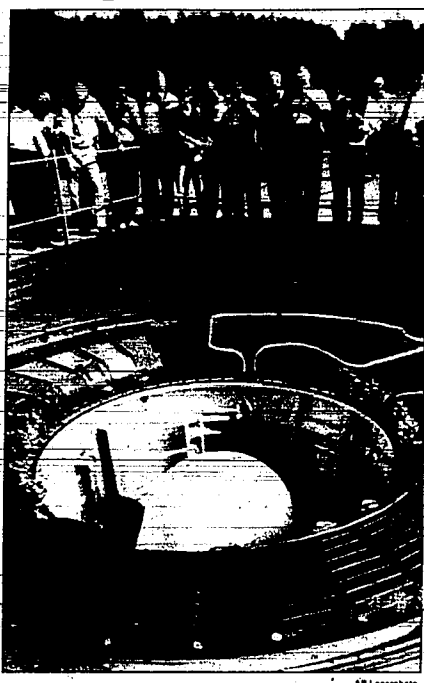
TEYKOVO, U.S.S.R. — Inside a concrete bunker deep beneath an isolated birch forest here, a Soviet air force major sits before a computerized console with a small green button that could send 200-kiloton intercontinental ballistic missiles soaring out of nearby silos toward the United States or Western Europe.

For visitors crammed between vast banks of computers in the small underground chamber, it was an unsettling scene. In an unprecedented gesture of glasnost, or openness, a U.S. congressional delegation — men who have authorized hundreds of billions of dollars to counter Soviet nuclear forces — this week became the first foreigners ever allowed inside an operational ICBM launch control center, according to Soviet military officials.

A few hundred feet from the subterranean room, Soviet officials pulled back a massive metal lid to reveal the gleaming white nosecone of an SS-11 ICBM poised in its underground silo. "It was spooky," said Rep. Les Aspin, D-Wis., chairman of the House Armed Services Committee delegation touring the missile base about 240 miles northeast of Moscow. "You're standing in that control room thinking the missile in the silo outside is pointed at Philadelphia or Detroit."

Some Soviets were almost as disbelieving. "I couldn't imagine something like this happening ever two years ago," said Sergei Rogov, an adviser to the defense committee of the Soviet legislature, host of the congressional tour.

For the Soviets, the openness comes amid great caution. The SS-11 is the oldest intercontinental ballistic missile in their arsenal — so old that the single-warhead

missile is being systematically phased out and replaced with the newer, more lethal SS-20. And the Soviets chose to show the Americans a warhead and control center believed to be the oldest and least modernized among the 400 remaining SS-11s. "It's a way they can show you something without damaging national security," said Aspin, who is leading committee members,

Party proposes radical changes in structure of Soviet Union

MOSCOW — The Communist Party on Thursday opened the possibility of radical change in the Soviet Union's structure by offering new powers to the republics and a possible rewrite of the agreement that united them.

The party leadership tendered the proposal, published in its newspaper, Pravda, as its solution to the ethnic conflicts that threaten to rip apart the Soviet Union. More than 200 people have died in ethnic strife in the past 18 months, and groups in several of the 15 republics are calling for secession.

In its proposals, the party offers no specific solutions to stem the ethnic hatred that has led to clashes

involving Armenians, Azerbaijanis, Abkhazians, Georgians, Turks, Uzbeks and others. Some activists welcomed the party's attempt to compromise, but said vague promises of decentralization are no longer enough to solve "the nationalities question."

"The only solution is for the republics to be absolutely free," said Nodar Notadze, head of the People's Front in Georgia. The draft policy also calls for a law banning "nationalist and chauvinist" organizations, which could be used against groups demanding independence from Moscow.

The greatest concession offers the republics the power to question national laws before a strengthened

high court. That clause appeared to be aimed at Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania, which have amended their constitutions to proclaim their right to reject national laws. The Kremlin previously said this violated the Soviet Constitution.

Thursday's document said that to achieve a transformation of the Soviet federation, "the question has been raised of working out and signing a new union agreement instead of the Treaty on the Formation of the U.S.S.R. of 1922." That could be limited to the party's suggestion of expanded powers for republics. But it opens the possibility that radicals could push through radical change such as

Poland a step nearer non-Communist rule

WARSAW, Poland — Poland's Communist president, Gen. Wojciech Jaruzelski, Thursday accepted Lech Walesa's proposal that a new coalition led by the Solidarity opposition movement form the first government headed by non-Communists in Eastern Europe in more than 40 years.

After a two-hour meeting between Jaruzelski and Walesa, who were joined by Peasants' Party chairman Roman Malinowski and Democratic Party leader Jerzy Jozwiak, the state-run media announced that Communist Prime Minister Czeslaw Kiszczak formally submitted his resignation to the president, supposedly to clear the way for the new government.

Kiszczak had tried for two weeks to put together a "grand coalition" government with Solidarity, the Peasants and the Democrats. The two smaller parties, members of the Communists' ruling coalition since 1945, Thursday made official their switch to Solidarity's side, accepting the offer Walesa made Aug. 7.

Walesa and other leaders of the new coalition said the choice of a Solidarity prime minister was up to Jaruzelski, who was expected to announce the leader of the next government on Friday.

Until late Wednesday night, Walesa had reluctantly consented to become prime minister in a Solidarity-led government, although he insisted that others were better qualified for the post.

But after Solidarity's legislative caucus voted overwhelmingly to approve the new coalition, Walesa stiffened his resistance, and he continued Thursday to insist that his role was to help create the new government, not to lead it. "I'm not running for prime minister," he declared. Although Jaruzelski made no public statement Thursday on

Walesa's proposal, leaders of the three parties forming the new coalition agreed that the president had accepted the proposal, which their joint statement said would mean a government open to "all reform political forces represented in parliament." That language allows for the continued control of the defense and interior ministries by the Communists. To reassure Moscow that Poland will not leave the Warsaw Pact.

In an interview with West German television Wednesday night, Walesa reaffirmed that Poland would stay in the Warsaw Pact if a non-Communist government took power. "Poland cannot forget where it is situated," he said, "to whom it has obligations. You know we are in the Warsaw Pact—that cannot be changed," Walesa said. "During their meeting, Walesa offered Jaruzelski a list of three candidates for prime minister, according to Jacek Kuron, a Solidarity lawmaker and veteran dissident who spent nine years in prison for anti-government activism. Besides himself,

AIDS drug's success ends some trials

WASHINGTON — The government is ending part of its trial for the AIDS drug AZT because the study found it significantly slowed the progress of the deadly disease in certain patients, the Department of Health and Human Services announced Thursday.

AZT, also known as zidovudine, was being given to participants in the drug trial whose blood tested positive for the AIDS virus but whose disease progression was in an early stage.

Patients in the study were those who had blood tests of fewer than 500 T4 blood cells per cubic millimeter. Half of those in the study received AZT and the others received placebo.

HHS announced that a data and safety monitoring board "found that the participants with fewer T4 cells who received zidovudine, the rate of progression to AIDS or severe ARC (AIDS-related complex) was roughly half that of participants ... who received placebo."

The announcement said that all patients in the trial will now receive AZT. The study continues for patients whose T4 cell count is above 500.

The drug trial involved more than 3,200 volunteers. The trial was begun two years ago and was conducted in 32 locations. The announcement follows by two weeks a report that shows AZT slowed progression of the disease in persons with early AIDS-related complex.

About 1,200 of the participants had

Idaho senator is confident Rafters, bombers can coexist

TWIN FALLS — Republican Sen. Steve Symms says he can't see any reason why white-water rafters and Air Force bombers can't peacefully coexist in an expanded Saylor Creek Bombing Range.

"I'm certainly concerned about recreation and the protection of people in the state's interests," Symms said. But, he added, "If we're going to protect peace and freedom if we're going to spend \$30 billion on defense, we're going to have to

have a place to train our pilots." During a luncheon speech to the Gooding Chamber of Commerce and an afternoon press conference with reporters Thursday, Symms said he doesn't think recreational and military interests have to compete in plans to enlarge the Saylor Creek bombing area from approximately 100,000 acres to 1.6 million acres.

The expansion plan — which has drawn fire from local recreational, grazing and environmental groups — would extend the range's present constraints to within two miles of Twin Falls County's western boundary.

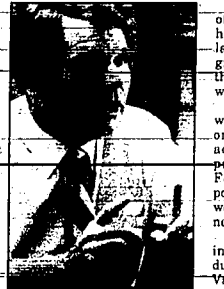
While Symms said Air Force officials are aware that they may have to "pay off" private landowners and others who hold grazing permits, he doesn't think the gunnery range would interfere with most recreational uses.

Besides, he said, the Air Force would drop live ammunition on only a portion of the 1.6 million acres. And the expansion would provide the Mountain Home Air Force with a "life insurance policy" guaranteeing that the base would remain active well into the next century.

Problems created by competing interests surfaced several times during Symms' visit to the Magic Valley.

Gooding County Commissioner Bob Muffley told Symms that new

Pro-abortion initiative needs clarification, Idaho official states

BOISE — A pro-abortion initiative needs clarification before it should be submitted to the voters, an attorney general's advisory says.

Idaho representatives of the National Organization for Women (NOW) have submitted the preliminary paperwork on an initiative to eliminate state control over abortions.

It's only two sentences long, but Deputy Attorney General John McMahon says as written, it would create a host of legal problems.

The initiative was submitted to the secretary of state's office Aug. 7. If backers are successful in obtaining 38,749 signatures, the proposal will go on the ballot. The deadline for gathering the signatures, once the drive starts, will be the first week of July next year.

Sponsors of the initiative could not be reached for comment on Thursday. The initiative proposal states only: "The state shall not compel any woman to complete or to terminate a pregnancy.

"Any existing state law that conflicts with Section 1 above is hereby repealed." But it isn't that simple, says an analysis

prepared by McMahon, chief deputy under Attorney General Jim Jones. Under Idaho election laws, any proposed initiative must be reviewed by the attorney general's office. The state's top legal officer then will "recommend to the petitioner such revision and alteration of the measure as may be deemed necessary and appropriate."

Deputy Secretary of State Ben Yurena said once the analysis is returned to the initiative's sponsors, they have 15 days to respond. The recommendations are advisory only, and initiative backers are free to reject them. Idaho has an abortion law, but like others

across the nation, it will not go into effect unless the U.S. Supreme Court reverses an earlier decision, Roe v. Wade, sharply limiting state authority to restrict abortions. The Idaho law, which will go into effect only if Roe vs. Wade is reversed, calls for criminal penalties of two to five years in prison for any doctor who performs an abortion, unless it is necessary to save the woman's life. Similarly, a woman who submits to an abortion can be sentenced to up to five years in prison, unless it's a medical necessity.

McMahon pointed out that the simple statement, "The state shall not compel any

woman to complete or to terminate her pregnancy," means that an abortion would be possible at any time, even in the advanced stages of pregnancy. He said that goes far beyond Roe vs. Wade.

"We read the initiative as going beyond Roe vs. Wade and removing the authority of the state to proscribe abortions at any time during the pregnancy, including the time after the fetus has become viable," McMahon said.

"The initiative would also preclude any state interference with a pregnancy even if terminating the pregnancy would save the life of the mother," he said.

Shrinking trade deficit fails to impress economists

WASHINGTON (AP) — The U.S. trade deficit shrank to \$8.17 billion in June, the smallest monthly imbalance since December 1984.

The government's report on Thursday was viewed by many economists as only a short-lived improvement.

The Commerce Department said the June deficit showed a dramatic 18.9 percent narrowing from a revised May figure of \$10.08 billion, reflecting record U.S. export sales and a drop in imports.

The June report, which was significantly better than had been expected, was hailed by the Bush administration as evidence that American manufacturers were enjoying continued success in penetrating foreign markets.

"The decline (in the trade deficit) was greater than market expectation and certainly is good news for the country," presidential press secretary Marlin Fitzwater told reporters in Kennebunkport, Maine.

The June improvement came from a 1.5 percent increase in U.S. exports, which pushed them to a record level of \$30.81 billion, and a 3.6 percent drop in imports, which fell to \$22.64 billion.

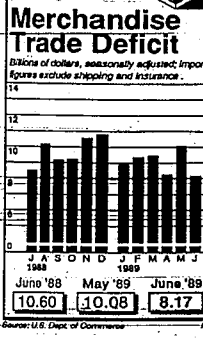
Private forecasters were decidedly less enthusiastic than the administration, with some contending that the June deficit figure was likely to be the best trade news America would get for some time.

They predicted that the deficit would widen in coming months under

the impact of a stronger dollar, which makes U.S. products more expensive on overseas markets.

The stock and bond markets also reacted negatively to the report, which was interpreted as showing that economic growth was stronger than previously believed. While such a development eases recession fears, it also diminishes hopes that the Federal Reserve will move to lower interest rates further.

Bruce Steinberg, an economist with Merrill Lynch, said the unexpectedly sharp improvement in the June trade figure and other recent good economic news would probably result in a big upward revision in the government's estimate of overall economic growth for the April-June quarter.



Installation, repairs bog down as strike continues

WASHINGTON (AP) — New telephone installation remained backlogged Thursday by a strike at four regional Bell phone companies, but customers were having better luck reaching operator assistance, company and union officials said.

Bill Bickers, spokesman for the striking Communications Workers of America local at Bell Atlantic, said service was "spotty in some places" as management personnel were pressed into unfamiliar duties. The company's blow on installation and repairs in some locations.

Operator-assisted calls also were "not up to normal level," but it's moderate, Bickers said. "In some locations it's really slow."

Recorded messages continued to tell 411 directory assistance callers that "due to the work stoppage, your call may be delayed." But telephone company officials said the waits were becoming shorter as managers got to know the computer equipment.

"We're finding that the delays have dissipated some because of the fact that our temporary operators have become more proficient with their skills," said Steve Ford, a spokesman for one of the four companies, Ameritech.

Operator-assisted calls, maintenance and repairs were being handled at near pre-strike levels in

many areas, officials said.

On-premises installations continued to be hard hit because of the strike by nearly 200,000 operators, clerks, technicians and others represented by the CWA and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers.

The strike began Aug. 6 against NYNEX, Bell Atlantic and Pacific Telesis and on Aug. 13 against Ameritech. The walkouts affected phone service in 20 states and the District of Columbia.

"We are deferring service that requires dispatch of a human being," said Larry Plumb, a spokesman for Philadelphia-based Bell Atlantic. "But if they are using service already in place... that kind of service is being taken care of. In a typical week that is 60 percent of the work."

Customers who are doing direct dialing are receiving service as normal," Plumb said. "Where customers need to talk to a company representative, we've seen improvement in service since the work stoppage as managers have gotten more familiar with their jobs."

Plumb said operator assistance "has returned to pre-work stoppage levels." As for directory assistance, "There are some customers who will experience delays... but we have seen improvements."

Senate witness: Cocaine-corruption widespread

WASHINGTON (AP) — A convicted drug smuggler testified Thursday that Colombian cocaine traffickers control police and key officials in a number of countries and ones were offered a chance to buy all the cocaine confiscated in the Bahamas.

"We were setting it up but I was arrested," Max Mermelstein testified from behind a screen while six federal bodyguards stood by.

In an electronically disguised voice, Mermelstein said he had

smuggled up to 65 tons of cocaine into the United States as an employee of "the boys from Colombia" before his arrest in 1986.

His testimony came at a hearing of the Senate Judiciary Committee, that its chairman, Sen. Joseph Biden, D-Del., said was designed to provide background for the comprehensive drug-fighting blueprint due from the Bush administration next month.

Mermelstein told the committee

the United States has been hampered in its effort to fight drug cartels in part "because we deal directly with the police and local governments and to the cartels."

Police and public officials except for high-ranking army officers are brought under control by the cocaine cartel through bribe money and the threat of murder, Mermelstein said.

"They own them," Mermelstein said. "Either they take the money

or they die."

He said such corruption is widespread and "in the Bahamas, it goes the way to the top."

He testified that he was once offered a deal by a Bahamian official of so much per kilo for any cocaine confiscated by the Bahamian government for distribution in the United States.

Undergrad discovers supernova

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — A 19-year-old engineering student has discovered a supernova, or exploding star, in a spiral galaxy more than 137 million light-years from Earth, the California Institute of Technology announced Thursday.

Celina Mikolajczak, of San Diego, made the discovery while examining photographic films taken on the 16-inch Schmidt telescope at Palomar Observatory, northeast of San Diego.

Caltech spokesman Robert Finn said Mikolajczak was looking for comets and asteroids as part of a summer program in which undergraduates conduct research under faculty supervision.

"My first thought was that it was a speck of dust," said Mikolajczak, who then examined more film and realized, "Wow, I think I've found something."

The discovery was confirmed with the help of Mikolajczak's faculty sponsor, Eleanor Holm, a planetary scientist at Jet Propulsion Laboratory.

Navy claims latest failure won't affect plans for Trident 2 missile

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Navy contended on Thursday that the latest test failure of the Trident 2 missile will not affect plans to put the submarine-launched weapon out to sea next year.

However, the admiral in charge of the new nuclear missile program says he'll order a delay "if I have to."

The weapon, popular on Capitol Hill and touted as the Navy's newest and most deadly nuclear missile, had few problems until underwater tests began earlier this year.

A Trident 2 missile exploded Tuesday, seconds after it was launched from the nuclear submarine Tennessee some 300 miles off the coast of Florida. It was the second such failure in three underwater test firings for the missile, each of which carries a \$26.5 million price tag.

The troubles came just weeks before House and Senate members meet to work out the final version of President Bush's 1990 military budget and could offer support for those who, in the era of loosened superpower tensions, seek to cut nuclear weapons programs in favor of more conventional systems.

The three-stage Trident 2 is a more lethal version of the weapon that is the heart of the Navy's nuclear deterrent, the Trident 1. The new version, built by the Lockheed Missiles & Space Co., is almost twice the weight of its predecessor and can carry from three to 12 nuclear warheads to individual targets.

The weapon is to be deployed in the 1990s aboard a new generation of submarines, providing the sea-based leg of America's land, sea and air nuclear forces.

Until the test failures, the missile had been one of the Defense Department's nuclear modernization programs to be mostly problem-free,

with 16 of 19 successful land launchings.

In a statement released Thursday at the Pentagon, the Navy said that despite the latest test failure, "no impact is presently foreseen on the planned deployment of the USS Tennessee in early 1990."

The Tennessee is to be the first of nine submarines equipped to carry 24 of the missiles.

The Navy statement said that the problems with underwater pressure on the missile appear to have caused electrical cables in the first-stage motor to sever, triggering the missile's self-destruct order.

Rear Adm. Kenneth C. Malley said in an interview published Thursday in The New York Times that he is confident his Strategic Operations Office would be able to fix the missile in time for deployment by the current target date of March 31.

Doles plan 4-country trip

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senate Republican Leader Bob Dole and Labor Secretary Elizabeth Dole, his wife, will leave today on a visit to four countries, including Poland, which is undergoing historic political change.

In announcing the trip, the minority leader's office said the pair will carry President Bush's greetings to the heads of state they will meet.

The Doles travel first to Soviet Armenia. The Doles will take with them relief and rehabilitation supplies furnished by Project Hope, a charitable organization.

The Doles will meet with a num-

ber of Polish figures over a two-day period, including President Wojciech Jaruzelski and Solidarity leader Lech Walesa, Dole's office said.

Besides the meetings with leading Polish figures scheduled for Thursday and Friday, Mrs. Dole will discuss possible Labor Department projects as part of the administration's proposed \$100 million aid package to Poland.

The pair will also visit Morocco and will wind up their 10-day trip Aug. 28 with a trip to The Netherlands and talks with Queen Beatrix.

Landlord fights to discriminate against unmarried couples

ST. PAUL, Minn. (AP) — Landlords opposed to premarital sex should have the religious freedom to deny housing to unmarried couples, a lawyer said Thursday in defense of a southern Minnesota man accused of discrimination.

"All discrimination is not bad," said James Anderson, who represented 33-year-old Layle French before a three-judge panel of the Minnesota Court of Appeals. "Layle's discriminating against what many people view as immoral — fornication."

Hundreds of supporters of the carpenter-and-former-Eagle Scout have turned out for rallies throughout the state. In addition, petitions and letters of encouragement have streamed in from around the country, including one from a group of about 40 Jewish Orthodox believers in Brooklyn, N.Y., Anderson said.

About 400 people from around the country have contributed \$1 each to a defense fund for French, which in-

cludes another \$2,000 from large contributors, Anderson said.

"A person's religious beliefs shouldn't be pushed aside so someone else can be free to practice pub-

lic immorality," he said. Anderson said it would be a setback for the civil rights movement in America if Minnesota prevails in its finding that French violated the state Human Rights Act for refusing to rent to a couple then engaged to be married.

The case involves "living in sin" issues which are in legal flux elsewhere in the United States:

- In Denver, the City Council voted 7-6 on May 1 to revoke a living-in-sin ordinance that prohibited unmarried people from living together.

- Councilwoman Cathy Reynolds, who fought for 13 years to repeal the law, had said it wasn't appropriate for the city to regulate whether a person is married "any more than we should regulate whether you go to church."

- Supporters of the 30-year-old code contended it encouraged strong family-oriented neighborhoods.

- In Massachusetts, three couples

filed a lawsuit five years ago charging they were illegally barred from public housing in Worcester because they were unmarried. State law, like the one in Minnesota, prohibits discrimination on the basis of marital status.

The Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination ruled in their favor, the Worcester Superior Court upheld that ruling, and the case is pending before the Massachusetts Appeals Court. The housing authority contends the law applies to individuals — for example, a divorced woman with children — not couples.

In the Minnesota case, French had said it wasn't appropriate for the former house in Marshall to his Parsons. But he said he quickly changed his mind and returned her damaged deposit after he decided it would be against his religious beliefs. Parsons had told French she would be living with her fiancé. The two are now married.

Memo warns cuts in NTSB may be costly

WASHINGTON (AP) — The National Transportation Safety Board has so few investigators it may have to drop nearly one-third of the 3,000 or so accident investigations it conducts a year, the agency's field operations director says in a memo quashed by his boss.

The memo's author, Herbert Banks, made his concerns known in a May 11 memo that projected the loss of six air safety investigators by year's end. That, he wrote, would force the NTSB to drop the number of investigations it can handle a year by 900.

"The Bureau's situation is critical and worsening," Banks wrote, saying that most "escalating" goes against the agency's congressional mandate to investigate all airplane crashes and "is not in the interest of public safety."

His memo, however, didn't make it to the five presidentially appointed NTSB board members for a hearing.

It was sent back by the board's staff director, Lloyd Miller, preventing the issue from being debated by the board and, perhaps, being aired at a public hearing. Miller thought it was not serious enough to be put before the board.

The NTSB's acting chairman, interviewed recently, disagreed with Banks' assessment.

James Kolstad said the evaluation was "overly pessimistic." He said no major investigations or critical safety problems would be "affected" at the NTSB, which examines airplane crashes, sea disasters, major highway accidents and pipeline breaks.

"There has been a cutback" in investigations, he said. "But, frankly, we've got fewer accidents; the accident rate is improving. That doesn't suggest we have enough people to investigate the accidents that exist, because we don't, but I think we're doing a better job on the ones that we are investigating."

Rafsanjani: Iran will work to free hostages if U.S. changes attitude

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — Iran's President Hashemi Rafsanjani said Thursday that Iran will work for the release of Western hostages in Lebanon if the United States adopts a friendlier stance toward the Islamic republic.

Rafsanjani made his comments to Pakistan's foreign minister after being sworn into office before the Majlis, Iran's Parliament.

"I have said many times that if the United States expects us to help in the Lebanese issue, it should show in practice that it has dropped its hostile stand against us," he said, citing Washington's freezing of Iranian assets and its support of Iraq in the Iran-Iraq war.

"Then we will be inclined to solve the issue," the official Islamic Republic News Agency quoted him as telling Foreign Minister Yaqub Khan of Pakistan.

IRNA, monitored in Cyprus, quoted Khan as saying he had been asked to seek Iran's cooperation in freeing the 16 hostages, who include eight Americans. Most are held by pro-Iranian groups.

At the swearing-in, Rafsanjani pledged to use the increased powers of the presidency to avoid political strife, but he acknowledged that political infighting has undermined efforts to form a Cabinet.

Rafsanjani, a middle-ranking clergyman, took over from Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, who was elected the Islamic Republic's supreme leader after the death of Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini on June 3.

The new president leads the so-called pragmatists in Iran, who favor improving relations with the West to gain technology and financing for rebuilding an economy devastated by the eight-year Iran-Iraq war.

Lebanese fear lull won't last

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Syrians and Christians traded shellfire Thursday, but it was a relative lull in the 5-month-old artillery war and people emerged from shelters to replenish food stocks in case fierce exchanges resumed.

The devastating artillery and rocket barrages that have ravaged the city abated soon after the U.N. Security Council passed a cease-fire resolution Tuesday night in New York, but residents of Beirut feared the lull would not last.

Police said shells landed in Beirut's Moslem and Christian sectors and along the Christian-held coast north of the city, killing a 7-year-old girl and wounding three people.

France said it was sending the aircraft carrier Foch on a possible evacuation mission to join the destroyer Duquesne, which was dispatched Tuesday to aid the French community.

Lebanon was a French mandate until 1943 and about 7,000 French citizens live in the country, 86 percent of them with dual nationality.

All but 150,000 of Beirut's 1.6 million people have left since the battle began March 8 between Gen. Michel Aoun's Christian army units and a Moslem alliance led by Syrian soldiers stationed in Lebanon. Total casualties by police count, nearly all civilians, as 776 killed and 2,076 wounded.

China's defense minister detained

HONG KONG (AP) — Soldiers loyal to China's president detained the defense minister and several commanders in a dispute over a top military post vacated by Zhao Ziyang, the purged Communist Party boss.

They said President Yang Shangkun, a central figure in the martial law crackdown on the student-led pro-democracy movement, apparently ordered the action to strengthen his control of the Chinese military.

In Beijing, government spokesman Yuan Mu confirmed reports that student leader Wang Dan had been arrested and said Zhao, who has not been seen in public since May 18, was leading a "completely normal life."

A Shanghai newspaper said authorities arrested or were investigating 99 people accused of involvement in illegal workers' groups that plotted to establish a "people's party" and kidnap officials. The Shanghai Liberation Daily said the groups planned to overthrow the government.

Staff members of the Guangming Daily, the Communist Party's leading newspaper, said senior editor Yao Kihua, 61, had been asked to retire.

He appeared to be the latest victim

of a purge in which at least 10 intellectuals have been dismissed from colleges and research centers and an outspoken columnist for the paper Dai Qing, who was arrested for supporting pro-democracy protests.

In the military power struggle, soldiers loyal to Yang went to the Beijing residence of Defense Minister Qin Jiwei about 6:40 p.m. Wednesday and took him and one of his armed guards away, the sources said.

Other troops detained the heads of the Beijing, Guangzhou and Nanjing military districts, who supported Qin and were in Beijing for an important meeting, they said.

121 Vietnamese return home from Hong Kong

HONG KONG (AP) — A group of 121 Vietnamese returned Thursday to the land they fled, the largest voluntary repatriation of refugees from Hong Kong's tented camps.

Waving handkerchiefs and clutching bags packed with clothes and radios, the refugees boarded a Boeing 737 at Hong Kong's airport and took off for Hanoi.

From there, the 46 men, 40 women, 17 boys and 18 girls will be taken to their hometowns and monitored by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees.

"I think this is an extremely hopeful sign," said Robert van Leeuwen, head of the U.N. refugee office in Hong Kong, as the jet's engines roared behind him. "The Vietnamese seemed very hopeful to go back."

Attempt to ignite booster fails

DARMSTADT, West Germany (AP) — A fourth attempt to boost a star-gazing satellite into its designated orbit failed Thursday, and the mission may have to be revised, the European Space Agency said.

A fifth attempt to ignite the booster of the High Precision Parallax Collecting Satellite will be made Monday, the agency said.

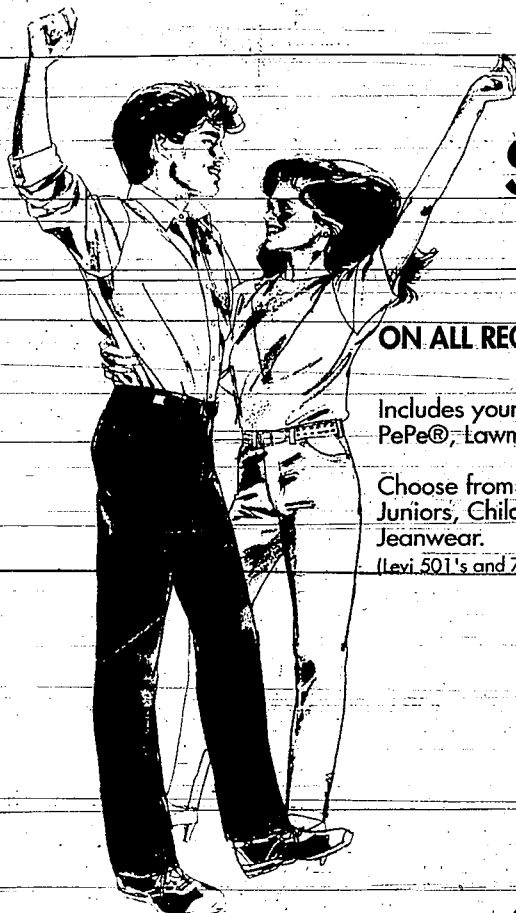
The Apogee Boost Motor is needed to propel the satellite into its geostationary orbit at an altitude of 22,220 miles above the equator.

Hipparcos, launched Aug. 9 by the space agency's Ariane rocket, is designed to provide precise measurement of the positions and motion of the stars.

Scientists involved in the project are considering a revised mission for the satellite in case they fail to ignite the booster, according to a statement from the space agency's operations center in Darmstadt, near Frankfurt.

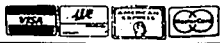

South African groups plan rallies to defy government

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — Members of outlawed anti-apartheid groups said Thursday they would hold a series of rallies this weekend, the latest phase in a new campaign to defy government suppression of dissent.

In Cape Town, police halted a march led by Anglican Archbishop Desmond Tutu in support of the opposition campaign.

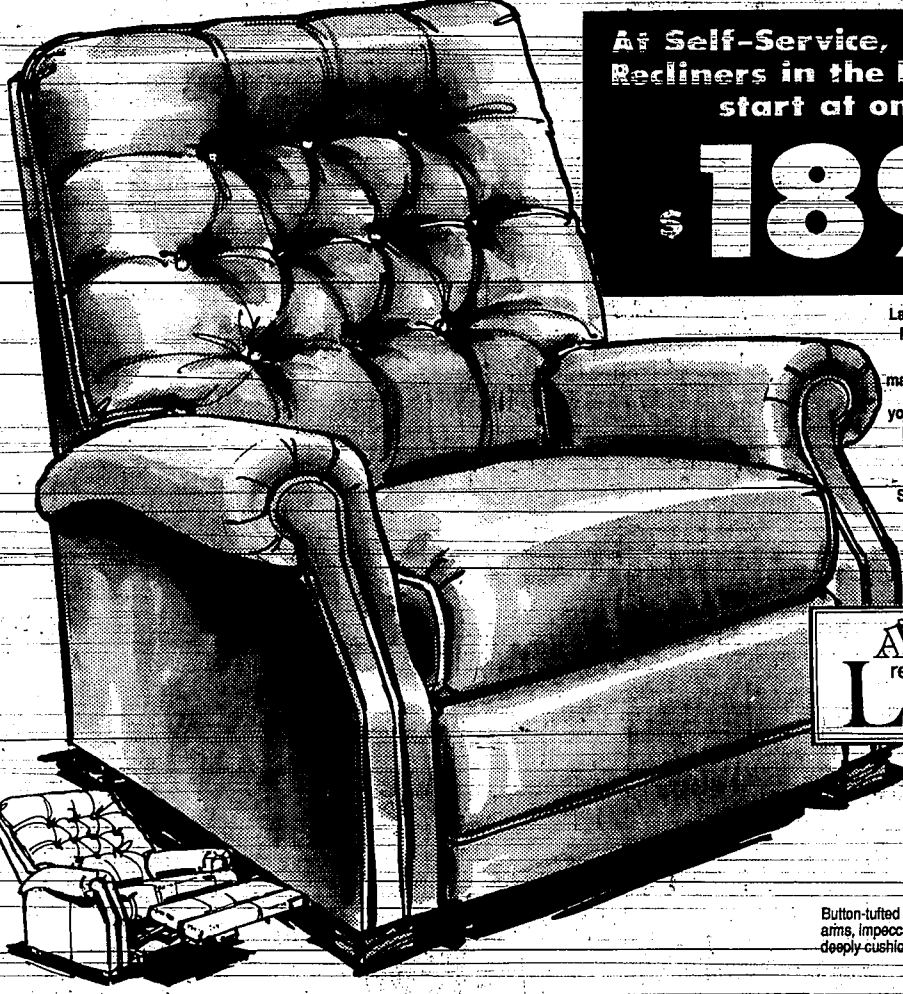
The police escorted Tutu and about 50 other people back to St. George's Cathedral about 30 minutes after they began marching through the city center protesting the arrests of former prisoners who were defying restrictions imposed on them.

Plans for the weekend rallies were announced at a news conference at the Central Methodist Church in downtown Johannesburg. Plainclothes police officers were present and confiscated a reporter's tape-recording of the announcement.

Titus Mafolo, an executive of the banned United Democratic Front, said it was possible that police might arrest the five white, black and Indian activists who announced the campaign while dressed in United Democratic Front T-shirts. Such items are banned under the government's emergency regulations.

"We don't plan our actions having that (detention) in mind. Otherwise we wouldn't plan anything," Mafolo said.

Pearl Harbor attack planner Genda dies

TOKYO (AP) — Minoru Genda, one of the planners of Japan's surprise attack on Pearl Harbor and a former member of Parliament, died Tuesday of heart failure. He was 84.

A graduate of Japan's naval academy, Genda was a young aviation staff officer who was called in to plan the attack on the U.S. Pacific fleet in Hawaii that brought the United States into the war.

Genda directed much of the secret training in Japanese waters before the attack and, on Dec. 8, 1941, he was aboard one of the Japanese carriers that launched the raid.

Europeans ban African elephant ivory imports

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — The executive arm of the European Community said Thursday it has adopted a ban on imports of ivory from African elephants. Carlo Ripa di Meana, who is in charge of environmental affairs for the European Commission, said the decision shows the desire of the 12-nation trading bloc to protect animals threatened with extinction.

The commission decided Aug. 11 to enforce the ban. It earlier had told member nations they should no longer approve permits for ivory imports.

An international conference on trading in endangered species will be held in October to decide whether to prohibit trafficking in ivory.

Magistrate recommends rejection of Andrews' appeal

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — A federal magistrate late Thursday recommended that the second of William Andrews' appeals be rejected, moving the death row inmate a step closer to execution next week for his role in the 1974 torture-slayings of three people.

Magistrate Ronald N. Boyce's 90-page recommendation was submitted to U.S. District Judge David Sam, who was expected to render his formal ruling Friday morning.

The defense will appeal the recommendation to Sam, said Robert Anderson, Andrews' Salt Lake City attorney, who sent a letter to the judge on Thursday requesting the opportunity to submit briefs and hold a hearing.

"He's obligated under the law to make a (new) review of the entire record, which stands at 10,000 pages," Anderson said. Should Sam concur with Boyce's recommendation, defense attorneys will appeal to the 10th Circuit Court in Denver, where they already have a pending appeal of Sam's rejection of Andrews' first civil rights appeal.

Asked if he considered Boyce's recommendation a defeat, Anderson replied, "It's not pleasant to be ruled against."

Sam's decision on the second appeal, a writ of habeas corpus, was to come the same day the State Board of Pardons was to announce its decision on last week's commutation hearing.

The board was considering whether to commute Andrews' sentence to life in prison or leave the death penalty in place.

At nearly 35 years, Andrews, 34, of Jonesboro, La., is the nation's longest-standing death row inmate. Barring a stay or commutation, he is to die by injection Tuesday at Utah State Prison.

In his habeas corpus proceeding, Andrews contended his constitutional rights were violated by being forced to accept as a public defender an inexperienced attorney, and a judge's failure to instruct the jury it could convict Andrews of second-degree murder.

The appeals also argued a mistrial should have been declared when a juror found a note bearing the words "Hang the niggers," during a lunch break.

However, Boyce wrote Thursday that while Andrews' lawyers had been resourceful in their arguments and research, his analysis "supports the conclusion that the petitioner's application for habeas corpus to this court should be dismissed as procedurally barred from... consideration."

In other words, Boyce said, defense attorneys either had raised issues already dispatched in other courts or now claim in violation of procedural rules that have governed Andrews' decade-and-a-half of appeals.

The state has consistently argued that Andrews' latest appeals amount to a last-ditch attempt to avoid the

death penalty and constitute an abuse of the appeals process itself. The Utah Supreme Court last year concurred, rejected a 1988 appeal on the grounds of default.

On Aug. 8, Sam adopted Boyce's recommendation to dismiss Andrews' civil rights appeal, filed at the same time as the writ of habeas corpus, saying the writ was the proper course of appeal.

Earlier Thursday, a state prosecutor, responding to Andrews' appeal before the Utah Supreme Court, argued that the condemned man cannot argue the dismissal of a trial juror violated his rights during black because a defense attorney first objected to the man.

Andrews and Pierre Dale Selby were convicted of killing two women and a man during an April 1974 robbery at the Ogdan Hi-Fi Shop. Five victims were forced to drink caustic liquid drain cleaner and one woman was raped before all were shot in the head. Two men survived.

Andrews helped administer the drain cleaner, but Selby said prior to his 1987 execution that Andrews had left the shop before the shots were fired.

In his petition to the state high court, Andrews had argued that former prosecutor Robert Newey's statement that a black potential juror was dismissed partly because of his race unfairly left Andrews and Selby, both black, to be judged by an all-white jury.

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Reservations over the Bonneville School Board's refusal to cover full cost of any increase in group health insurance premiums could undermine a proposed district teacher contract needed to head off a strike next week.

BOISE (AP) — A federal judge has decided that an inmate of the Idaho State Penitentiary is abusing the legal system, and has signed an order that he will not be allowed to file any more lawsuits unless he can show they are filed in good faith.

U.S. District Judge Harold Ryan earlier this month ruled against a 90-page civil rights lawsuit filed by Keith Gilbert of Kootenai County. It named 39 defendants, mostly state and other officials, claiming that they violated a federal anti-racketeering law and deprived him of his rights.

Non-Coeur d'Alene residents irk mayor

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — Spokane County, Wash., residents who are clogging Coeur d'Alene's parking areas, beaches and golf course should pay for their fun, says Mayor Ray Stone.

Idaho wilderness plan author to tour

LEWISTON (AP) — The author of a conservationist-backed Idaho wilderness plan, Pennsylvania Rep. Peter Kostmayer will tour Idaho later this month in a trip sponsored by the Sierra Club.

Kostmayer, D-Pa., whose bill would designate about 3.9 million of Idaho's 9 million acres of roadless federal forest as wilderness, will meet with environmentalists in Boise, fly over central Idaho and take a horseback tour of the Frank Church-River of No Return Wilderness. His visit stretches from Aug. 27 to Sept. 3.

Court upholds ruling against Alumet Co.

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Court of Appeals has agreed with a district judge in a long-running lawsuit over a proposed phosphate mining operation in southeastern Idaho.

The court on Thursday unanimously ruled for Bear Lake Grazing Co. in its lawsuit against Alumet Co. over a 20-year failure to develop substantial production at phosphate mine in Caribou County, upholding earlier decisions by District Judge William Woodland.

In 1964, John Archer and his wife signed an agreement with the Bear Lake Stockmen's Association for the lease of certain property to develop a phosphate mine. In 1974, he assigned the lease to Alumet, a partnership of several national corporations.

The association became Bear Lake Grazing Co. and in 1984 served notice of termination upon Alumet, contending only a minimum amount of phosphate had been mined in the

previous 20 years.

Woodland ruled the contract contained a covenant that Alumet would produce 1 million tons of ore per year, a level upheld by the Court of Appeals.

The court upheld Woodland's rulings in three other associated cases involving procedural matters.

In another court ruling released Thursday, the Idaho Supreme Court upheld the Industrial Commission's decision that a trucker was the em-

ployer of two drivers and thus responsible for unemployment benefits. Key to the Supreme Court appeal from employer Dick Hill was whether he met a deadline for filing notice of appeal from the original determination.

The commission ruled the deadline for that notice was April 15, 1987, but notice of appeal wasn't received in Boise until April 23. A secretary testified she mailed the notice about April 10 at Weiser but officials said

the usual practice was for mail deposited in Weiser to be sent to Boise before it is postmarked.

Robert Huntley, who retired from the court earlier this month, concurred but said the Department of Employment should change its rule about using postmarks to determine whether a deadline was met. Since mail is moved to regional centers before processing, postmarks no longer precisely indicate when something is mailed, he said.

Citizen group's efforts result in porno citation

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — An eastern Idaho citizens group is making good on its pledge to help rid the region of material it considers pornographic.

Acting on a complaint from Idaho Citizens Against Pornography, Idaho Falls Police on Thursday served agents for Ray's Mini Market with a third citation for violating anti-obscenity ordinances.

A day earlier, police armed with a warrant seized 2,000 magazines and books and seven videotapes from the business. Last month, a search of the same establishment resulted in the seizure of another 300 publications.

Store Clerk Yanz Jia Kim, 47, faces charges of distributing obscene material and publicly displaying offensive sexual material, and Bonneville County Prosecutor Kimball Mason said similar citations will be served on a second person involved in the operation of the store.

Each charge carries a maximum penalty of six months in jail and a \$300 fine upon conviction.

Idaho Citizens Against Pornography has been circulating petitions asking businesses to stop selling material the group feels is pornographic.

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — Drazen Petrovic, considered by some to be the best basketball player in Europe, has signed an NBA contract with the Portland Trail Blazers, but the Yugoslavian guard must still get out of an agreement with the Spanish team Real Madrid.

"This is my dream," Petrovic said Thursday at a news conference at Trail Blazer headquarters. "I'm 25 and I think it is the best time to play in the NBA. This is my decision."

The contract, signed shortly after he arrived late Wednesday, may make the 6-foot-3 Petrovic the highest-paid European player in the NBA.

Details of the contract weren't revealed, but Bucky Buckwalter, the Blazers' vice president for player personnel, said it was in line with the one signed by Soviet guard Sarunas Marciulionis with the Golden State Warriors. That contract pays Marciulionis about \$1 million per year for three years.

Trail Blazers' president Harry Glickman would only say the agreement is multiyear. Before he can play for Portland, Petrovic, who played in an exhibition game against College of Southern Idaho in Twin Falls four years ago, must win his lawsuit against the Spanish club Real Madrid and the NBA.

Petrovic contends his contract with the

Spanish team has a buyout clause and he has provided a pact signed in 1986 that provides for payment of \$200,000 for each of the three years left on his Real Madrid contract.

However, the Spanish professional league has supplied the NBA with a 1988 document that includes no buyout clause. Petrovic's attorney, Nicholas Goyak, says the Spanish league is deliberately misleading the NBA.

The NBA, citing its agreement with the Spanish league, had prohibited the Blazers from negotiating with Petrovic. But last week Circuit Judge Philip Abraham of Multnomah County granted a temporary restraining order allowing him to sign with Portland.

If Petrovic loses his lawsuit, he won't be allowed to play in the NBA, but will still receive compensation from the Trail Blazers, Glickman said. A hearing is scheduled next Thursday on Petrovic's request for a preliminary injunction.

A memo from Petrovic's Spanish agent, obtained by the Spanish sports newspaper Marca, indicated the Trail Blazers would make a \$1 million loan as part of the deal, apparently to help cover the buyout clause in the Real Madrid pact. Glickman would say only that Petrovic's contract included provisions to aid with the buyout of the Spanish contract.

No suspension for shoving but Rose loses round in court

Pete Rose was neither suspended nor fined for his part in a shoving incident with umpire Joe West in Cincinnati Tuesday night, but Thursday's news wasn't all good for the Reds' manager.

A three-judge panel of the 6th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals unanimously rejected Rose's bid to overturn a decision July 31 by U.S. District Judge John D. Holschuh to

keep Rose's lawsuit against Commissioner Bart Giamatti in federal court rather than state court.

Rose has claimed that Giamatti pre-judged his investigation into the manager's alleged gambling activities, a contention supported by Judge Norbert A. Nadel of the Hamilton County Common Pleas Court.

Nadel issued a temporary restraining order June 25 that has prevented Giamatti from conducting a hearing that could result in Rose's suspension for life if it is deter-

mined he bet on games involving the Reds.

Lawyers for Giamatti want the case heard in federal court, where the authority of the commissioner has always been supported and where judges are not subject to the pressures on elected state judges such as Nadel.

Lawyers for Rose had wanted it returned to the state court in his hometown of Cincinnati.

The appellate judges, in their four-page ruling, said that the appeal Rose sought

was not appropriate because Holschuh had properly applied settled legal principles regarding federal-state jurisdiction.

Holschuh had concluded that Rose's lawsuit belonged in federal court because Rose is based in Cincinnati and Giamatti in New York. The appeals court also said it was not inclined to give Rose's appeal special treatment merely because it is controversial.

"The rights of the parties do not change in proportion to their notoriety," the appeals judges wrote.

Volume on the floor of the Big Board came to 157.56 million shares, up from 150.06 million in Wednesday's session.

Nationwide, consolidated volume in NYSE-listed issues, including trades in those stocks on regional exchanges and in the over-the-counter market, totaled 185.66 million shares.

The Commerce Department reported that the June U.S. trade deficit narrowed to \$8.17 billion from a revised \$10.08 billion in May. The improvement was due mainly to a 1.5 percent increase in exports to a record level of \$39.91 billion, while imports fell 3.6 percent to \$39.08 billion.

The stock and bond markets initially rallied after the report, which eased recession worries. But closer inspection aroused bondholders' concern that the economy is too strong and that the Federal Reserve might not ease credit conditions.

Despite the busier pace, the market was "unusually featureless," with the exception of airline stocks, traders said.

As measured by Wilshire Associates' index of more than 5,000 actively traded stocks, the market declined \$11.781 billion, or 0.35 percent, in value from Wednesday.

The NYSE's composite index of all its listed common stocks fell 0.69 to 191.36.

Among most actively traded issues on the NYSE, UAL Corp., parent of United Airlines, rose 14 3/4 to 266 1/2 on news that billionaire's son Marvin Davis raised his bid to \$275 a share, or \$8.19 billion.

Delta Air Lines rose 1 to 75 1/4. Continental Bank gained 1/4 to 23 and AT&T rose 1/4 to 39 3/4.

Hewlett-Packard, meanwhile, fell 1/4 to 51. Navistar lost 1/4 to 4 3/8 and Bristol Myers dropped 1/4 to 47 3/4.

Standard & Poor's industrial index fell 1.48 to 394.57, and S&P's 500-stock composite index declined 1.21 to 344.45.

The NASDAQ composite index for the over-the-counter market rose 0.04 to 460.63. At the American Stock Exchange, the market value index closed at 378.34, down 1.28.

"I make the slam more than 80 percent of the time," allied South. "It took a miserable lie of the cards to beat me."

South was right in what he said. Left unaid was the fact that the slam was cold.

Dummy's club ace won, and trumps fell nicely. In two rounds, the ace and king of diamonds combined. West's discard spelling bid problems for South. Facing a loser in each minor, South led a spade to his jack. Had this won, he would have enjoyed a discard on dummy's spade king. It lost, sending the slam "one down." South discarding a diamond on dummy's spade king.

South missed his chance for a cinch play. After the trumps fall, South should cash the ace and king of spades and ruff a spade. Next he cashes the diamond ace and exits with a club, a trick that must be lost in any event. Regardless of who wins this trick, the slam is now on ice. If the defense leads clubs or spades, South enjoys a ruff and discard. And if East wins and leads a diamond, South will have no loser in that suit.

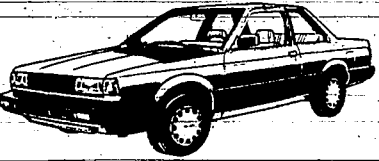

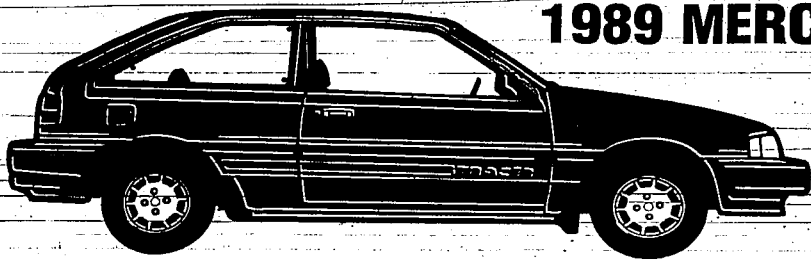

Soviet, Chinese, Americans work together writing play

FARGO, N.D. (AP) - In a tranquil, tree-lined park near the prairie, teen-agers from China, the Soviet Union and the United States have been writing a play they hope will help make their dreams of peace come true.
 The script opens with characters from each country on a stage behind a mountain topped with a star-Discord among them is represented by fog as they struggle musically, occasionally striking a note of harmony.
 At the end of the play, the star on the mountain comes to the characters and pieces of the mountain form a bridge to the audience.
 "Our goal must be to show peace and friendship," said Shan Jian, one of two 16-year-olds from Beijing who joined two others from the Soviet Union and the United States in writing the script.
 Next summer, 16 students from China and the Soviet Union are expected to arrive in Fargo to work with young American artists on the performance. The play, financed through an assortment of private and public sources, then is scheduled to tour the United States, the Soviet Union and China.
 "It's really a process to create a link between the people of these nations," says Vicki Cepeluis, director of the "Imagine" program at the Trollwood Performing Arts School.

Amanda Blake dies of cancer, 60 Singer Al Jarreau keeps on movin'

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — Amanda Blake, who played Miss Kitty in television's long-running "Gunsmoke" series, has died of cancer at age 60.

Mary General Hospital spokeswoman Jerri Ewan read a statement late Wednesday saying Miss Blake, a longtime resident of the Sacramento area, died Wednesday evening. She said memorial services were being planned.

Miss Blake, a one-time two-pack-a-day smoker, had undergone surgery for oral cancer in 1971, and afterward made appearances throughout the country on behalf of the American Cancer Society.

In 1964, the society named her as the recipient of its annual Courage Award, which President Reagan presented in the Oval Office.

Miss Blake was born Feb. 20, 1929, as Beverly Louise Neill in Buffalo, N.Y., according to a biography prepared by CBS during the "Gunsmoke" series.

She was educated in Buffalo, Gainesville, Ga., and Claremont, Calif., where she moved with her parents in 1943.

She made her dramatic debut as a 10-year-old in a school pageant in Buffalo, and later studied acting at Buffalo's Studio Club.

She signed with MGM while still in her

teens, and her first film role was in the 1950 film, "Stars in My Crown."

Miss Blake was at CBS when she heard that the successful "Gunsmoke" radio show was going to be made into a television pilot. The first show was in 1956.

"I knew I had to have the part of Kitty, so I hounded the producer until I got it," she said in a 1971 interview.

To do the "Gunsmoke" series, Miss Blake commuted by private plane from

her home near Phoenix.

Miss Blake left "Gunsmoke" in 1974 after 19 years.

In a 1984 interview with the Los Angeles Times, she said: "I was tired and it was time to go. It was the end of the trail. The show only lasted one more year without me."

"Gunsmoke" was set in Dodge City, Kan., in the late 1800s, starring James Arness as Marshal Matt Dillon, Milburn Stone as "Doc" Adams and Miss Blake as Kitty Russell, the owner and operator of the Longbranch Saloon.

When the suggestion is made to Al Jarreau that his current touring schedule, which has included stops in 30 European cities and a southern swing of the United States before it ends in September, does not sound so bad, he can only laugh in disbelief.

"I've been gone half this year already. I've been home two weeks this year. That's not bad? Wake up! But then, I could not have any work at all," Jarreau said in a recent telephone interview.

It would be difficult to imagine Jarreau not singing somewhere. He is simply too gifted a talent, too skilled a performer not to be singing before a crowd, which is the kind of setting he prefers.

It's (touring) great work. The road is tough, but it's always interesting," Jarreau said. "I (like) getting out there with your people and doing this music in these situations every night and making it work and getting surprised."

schooling, earning a bachelor's degree from Ripon College in Wisconsin. While in school, Jarreau sang on weekends and during holidays to stay sharp.

Jarreau then earned a master's degree in psychology from the University of Iowa and set out for San Francisco, where he became a rehabilitation counselor for the state of California.

But the microphone still beckoned. Jarreau was playing three nights a week with a trio that was headed by pop-jazz impresario George Duke in a club that was frequented by a visitor named Bill Withers, who was stationed at a Navy base nearby.

In 1968, Jarreau realized that he would make a better singer than counselor and began touring California spots with a guitarist. It would take seven years of schlepping clubs in New York and Los Angeles before he would get a recording deal with Warner Bros. in 1975.

ensued, as Jarreau racked up American and German Grammy awards, as well as winning vocalist awards and reader polls from the nation's top jazz magazines over the next seven years.

But it was not until he won a Grammy in 1981 for Best Pop Male performance for his album, "Breakin' Away," which featured the hit, "We're In This Love Together," that most music listeners came to hear of Jarreau and his wondrous talent.

With "Breakin' Away," Jarreau began to craft his music more consciously toward crossover appeal, a trend that has distressed many music critics, but not Jarreau.

"There are people who are disturbed that I'm not the hard-line jazzist that they thought I was going to be since my first album. On the other hand, I can't help doing just what I do," Jarreau said.

"I feel fortunate in finding people who have understood that and have helped me sort of test the waters in the barriers; but the songs still talk on that Al Jarreau edge that I just can't help."

Jarreau followed up "Breakin' Away" with a self-titled album in 1983 that yielded three of his biggest hits, "Mornin'" "Boogie Down," and "Trouble in Paradise."

Movie classic celebrates 50 years of following the yellow brick road

HOLLYWOOD — Jack Haley Jr. was only 8, but he has a vivid memory of his visit to the set of "The Wizard of Oz" in 1939.

"The colors, that's what I remember — the most impressive, incredible color I've ever seen. They must had every kind of light in Hollywood on that set," he said.

"And, of course, I remember the Munchkins: I thought they lived right there on that movie set. I know they were adults because some of them had mustaches and beards. But I thought they were little people who lived in those little huts."

Haley has lived with "The Wizard of Oz" most of his life. The aura of playing the Tin Woodman never left his father, Jack Haley. And now, for the golden anniversary of the movie classic, Haley is preparing a film history of the production, which will appear on CBS next spring, prior to the network's 50th anniversary of the film.

The movie also appeared on NBC eight times.

"The Wizard of Oz" has a long history in cinema. The author of the Oz books, Lyman Frank Baum (1856-1919) made silent movies with the characters from 1914 to 1917. He started the Oz Film Manufacturing Co. in 1914, turning out shorts as well as feature-length movies. They were fairly successful, but distribution problems and his own failing health caused him to close down the company.

Samuel Goldwyn purchased the rights to the Oz books in 1932 for \$40,000 but made no films. When Walt Disney's "Snow White" and "Seven Dwarfs" proved a smash in 1937, studios hunted for children's classics. Louis B. Mayer bought the rights from MGM for \$300,000.

Mayer's son-in-law had directed such hard-hitting films as "I Am a Fugitive From a Chain Gang" and "Little Caesar," was a curious choice to produce "The Wizard of Oz." He assigned writer-after-writer in an attempt to fashion a script. E.Y. (Yip) Harburg and Harold Arlen were assigned to write the songs.

Because of the large budget, MGM wanted Shirley Temple, Hollywood's No. 1 moneymaker, to give the film-office insurance. Darryl Zanuck refused to release 20th Century-Fox's most valuable asset, Judy Garland, who was taken out of B pictures to star as Dorothy.

Leroy originally wanted Ray Bolger to play the Tin Woodman. "I'm not a tin performer, I'm fluid,"

he argued, seeking the Scarecrow instead. He won his case, and the Woodman-befell-Buddy-Ebsen.

Ed Wynn and W.C. Fields both declined the role of the Wizard according to "The Making of 'The Wizard of Oz'" by Alison Harrold. The part was given to Frank Morgan, who like Ebsen and Bolger was an MGM contract player. Bert Lahr came from Broadway to play the Cowardly Lion.

One substitution came when the aluminum paint poisoned Buddy Ebsen, and Jack Haley assumed the role.

"The Wizard of Oz" was completed

on March 16, 1939. The final budget was \$2,777,000, a huge amount for those times. MGM launched a big promotion campaign in hopes of recouping the investment.

"The Wizard of Oz" premiered at the Grauman's Chinese theater on Aug. 15, 1939. The New York opening followed two nights later at the "air-conditioned" Capitol theater on Broadway.

The reviews were mixed. The New York Times' Frank Nugent declared: "It is so well intentioned, so genial, and so gay that any reviewer who would look down his nose at the fun-making should be spanked and sent off, suppersless, to bed."

A number of critics qualified for such treatment. The New Yorker called "The Wizard of Oz" a "stinkero" which "displays no trace of imagination, good taste or ingenuity."

Theater returns were good at first, then fell off. "The Wizard of Oz" grossed \$3,017,000 for the studio, causing a huge loss. A re-release in 1948-49 brought in \$1.5 million, enough to turn a bare profit.

"The Wizard" would have sunk into the limbo of failed movies except for television. In 1956, CBS was eager to broadcast "Gone With the Wind," but MGM refused to part with its biggest moneymaker.

A CBS executive suggested "The Wizard of Oz." The deal was struck for one screening at \$225,000, with an option for seven more at \$150,000 apiece. The film was shown on Nov. 3, 1956, and drew a huge rating. Later runs did even better. More Americans have seen "The Wizard of Oz" than any other movie, and that record is likely to continue into the 21st century.

'Wizrd of Oz' tales abound, and some may even be true

NEW YORK (AP) — Anything's possible in "Oz," and just about everything's possible in Hollywood. Like Dorothy as a blonde.

When shooting first began on "The Wizard of Oz," director Richard Thorpe put Judy Garland in a blond wig. He was later fired and replaced by Victor Fleming ("Gone With the Wind") and King Vidor. Garland ditched the golden locks and played the movie in her own hair.

"The Wizard of Oz," like most movies, abounds with anecdotes and tales both tall and true.

There's the story of the ragged coat Frank Morgan wore as Professor Marvel. It was purportedly purchased from a second-hand store in Los Angeles and, as the story goes, Morgan pulled out a pocket one day and found the name L. Frank Baum sewn inside. Baum wrote the original Oz stories.

Or, when Dorothy first meets the Lion and slaps him for growling at the Tin Man and Scarecrow, and the lion grabs his tail and cries, Garland burst into giggles on the set and delayed the shoot. Fleming, as the legend goes,

took Garland behind one of the trees and slapped her. The scene was shot and the take was good.

Later, the director called the three vaudeville stars "hams" for dancing down the Yellow Brick Road without little Judy.

And the vaudeville in Bert Lahr allowed him to come up with the classic movie line, "unusual weather here we having, ain't it?," when Dorothy and friends wake up in the poppy field during a snowstorm.

Ray Bolger, who played the Scarecrow, later said: "We joked a lot because that was the only way we could survive."

Costumes and makeup took their toll on Bolger. Margaret Hamilton (the Wicked Witch), Bert Lahr (the Lion) and Jack Haley (the Tin Woodman). Bolger's skin began to wrinkle because of the Scarecrow makeup and mask; Haley's 40-pound costume prevented him from sitting between takes; Hamilton had a green tint to her skin even when the movie was completed and her fake fingernails were always popping off.

'Wizrd of Oz' stars continued their careers after film success.

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — What ever happened to the Witch, Dorothy and the Scarecrow? Did their movie careers soar or plunge? Here's a brief look at what became of the stars who brought such memorable characters to the screen in "The Wizard of Oz."

Judy Garland became a full-fledged star as Dorothy. After co-starring with Mickey Rooney in youth musicals, she went on to other musical productions such as "Meet Me in St. Louis," "Easter Parade" and "Summer Stock." She also did dramas such as "The Clock." But because of her erratic behavior she was fired by MGM. In 1951, she made a smashing comeback at New York's Palace Theater and starred in a remake of "A Star Is Born." But her career never fully recovered. She died in London in 1969 of an accidental barbiturate overdose.

Frank Morgan, who played the Wizard, continued under contract to MGM, usually as a befuddled bumbler. He died in his sleep in 1949, after starting the role of Buffalo Bill in "Annie Get Your Gun."

Ray Bolger, the Scarecrow, returned to the stage for "Where's Charley?," which he also did on film. He made other film musicals such as "April in Paris" and "Babes in Toyland," and was active in television. He died in 1987.

Cowardly Lion Bert Lahr also returned to the theater for musical comedies as well as the existentialist

"Waiting for Godot." He appeared in the films "Rose Marie," "The Second Greatest Sex" and "The Night They Raided Minsky's." He died in 1968.

Jack Haley, the Tin Man, made a few films during the 1940s and did a cameo role in "Norwood" in 1970, under the direction of his son, Jack Jr. He died in 1979.

Billie Burke, who played the good witch Glinda, continued her specialty of dithering dowagers in "The Man Who Came to Dinner," "Rather of the Bride" and other films. The widow of producer Florenz Ziegfeld died in 1970 after a long illness.

Margaret Hamilton never achieved the same notoriety of her Wicked Witch, but she remained a busy character actress in such films as "My Little Chickadee," "State of the Union" and "Riding High." She became a familiar figure as Cora, the small town shopkeeper of the Maxwell House coffee commercials. She died in 1985.

Authors discover wisdom of TV despite its wasteland reputation

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Two authors journeyed into the vast wasteland of television and returned with 1,900 gems of wisdom. There's a little horse sense from Mr. Ed, and leave it to Beaver to add homespun sagacity.

Words to live by from the boob tube? "It's true, you just have to search for them," said Jack Mingo, who with John Javna wrote "Primitime Proverbs: The Book of TV Quotes," published Friday by Harmony Books of New York. "No one's ever looked to television for wisdom, but 100 million people can't be wrong."

The cherished quotes, which the

authors say already have become folklore, came from the mouths of Maxwell Smart, Fred Flintstone, Gilligan and the Skipper, too.

Among the adages, preserved for literary posterity under 231 topics, are Archie Bunker's summation of the Divine: "God don't make no mistakes. That's how he got to be God."

There are even sayings from four commercials, which are seemingly already heard often enough on the tube itself.

Those include one by Head and Shoulders shampoo, "You never get a second chance to make a first impression," and another by the National Enquirer, "Enquiring minds want to know."

Research for the book involved hundreds of hours of TV viewing by the two San Francisco Bay area writers. They also used 112 volunteer viewers, including Jim Davidson from the National Association for the Advancement of Perry Mason, a fan club.

"The generation that grew up with TV in the '50s and '60s is at the point it has a lot of disposable income and that's why there's a lot of TV nostalgia coming out on the market, like this book," said Davidson, who also publishes a monthly listing of TV shows from the '50s.

Mingo said television doesn't deserve its reputation as an "idiot box."

"It's always been considered a declassing thing to watch a lot of TV, so people are reluctant to admit they get anything good from any of it other than by watching a few hours of public television," he said. "But we found many things of the sort you'd find from philosophers, and that you don't expect to see in the mass media."

Sylvester Stallone proves in 'Lock Up' he's still king of live-action cartoons

HOLLYWOOD — "Lock Up" is yet another Sylvester Stallone macho fantasy in which he plays an underdog of superhuman endurance. Once again his ability to survive extreme brutality is used to justify equally savage acts of revenge. As experienced a rabble-rouser as Stallone is, he by now defies credibility to the point of inviting unintended laughter.



As a convict at the mercy of Donald Sutherland's crazy prison warden and his equally sadistic goons, Stallone survives one horrific physical and psychological assault after another, yet emerges after each hideous session as smiling and relaxed as if he had spent a weekend at a resort. Increasingly, Stallone has become the hero of live-action cartoons.

In his own view, Stallone's Frank Leone ought never have gone to prison in the first place. He is only avenging his foster father, an auto mechanic, after the old-man had been attacked by thugs with "connections" that enabled them to get Leone sent up. When Sutherland's hateful Warden Drummgoole refuses to allow Leone a deathbed visit to his foster father, he breaks out, even though his sentence has only two weeks to run. The incident draws Leone additional time at a "country club" facility, but it also generates bad publicity for the

warden, who is transferred to the notorious old Gateway penitentiary, a vast pile with an immense copper Beaux Arts dome (All this has happened before the picture starts — and thus requires a heavy dose of exposition). In the darkness of night, the warden somehow manages to have Leone moved to Gateway, where he will have six months in which to destroy the convict. The warden may be a man obsessed, but Stallone's writers make sure their star has plenty of scenes in which he can display his good-natured camaraderie with the nicer convicts. Consequently, "Lock Up" veers

constantly between unabashed sentimentality and unappealing violence, all of it underlined broadly by Bill Conti's score. As cynirically silly as "Lock Up" (rated R) essentially is, it is the work of film makers who know exactly what they want and how to get it. Lean and tough, Stallone looks great, and so does this film. Although at 108 minutes it is overly long, it moves well under John Flynn's slam-bang, pumped-up direction. Much of the time Stallone is laid-back and humorous, confident enough in his star power to allow his supporting players show turns. John Amos (as the warden's adamant but

reflective second-in-command), Sonny Landham (as a looming, vicious con who does the warden's bidding), Tom Sizemore (as the garrulous prisoner Dallas), Frank McRae (the hulking, kindly Eclipse) and Larry Romano (as the doomed, 20-year-old First Base). Sutherland seems to have tongue firmly in cheek, and Darlane Flugel has precious few moments as Leone's rather dim-seeming fiancée (Why doesn't she get the press to investigate Leone's transfer, for example?). As for Stallone, he's overdue in stretching his talent, not just his muscles.

Gimmicks in 'The Abyss' prove overly distracting

The following are capsule reviews and a rating grade for some of the movies now playing in the Magic Valley.

THE ABYSS (PG-13). It's perfectly possible to have a mindlessly pleasant time in this intense Tidy-Bowl blues. You just relax and let go. You may just wonder when you come out if you haven't pruned a little. Writer-director James Cameron's vision (carried with him not surprisingly since he was 17) is complete with men who say "Steady, big fella," to each other without a trace of irony. Mary Elizabeth Mastrantonio and ice-blue-eyed Ed Harris do manage to bring fire to all this.

BATMAN (PG-13). When millionaire Bruce Wayne puts on his Batbat, his Batgadgets and his world heavyweight's Batbel, almost nothing is left of him but glittering blue-gray eyes and a voluptuously full mouth. If a costume alone could stop crime, this one would, because it almost stops Michael Keaton: In the opposite corner, wearing purple satin, clown white, green hair and a permanent rictus, is Jack Nicholson as the Joker. It is his energy that keeps the picture alive.

HONEY, I SHRUNK THE KIDS (PG). Shrunken suburban kids, accidentally tossed out with the trash by their mad scientist daddy, try to fight their way back home through a yard turned into a jungle of monstrous bees and towering foliage. What happens to them is what happens to the movie: the humans shrivel into crawling piffles or caterwauling robots and the grass and the insects and giant cockles take over. It is a special effects marvel, no doubt — but the verbal jokes have the comic timing of a mating dance by blind, jealous elephants.

illness — this reunion of suicidal Riggs (Mel Gibson) and fatherly Murtough (Danny Glover) puts them through comic and crime-Buffing paces, as they battle a South African drug ring and team up with an embroiling mob accountant (Joe Pesci) to form a variation on the Three Stooges. Director Richard Donner and company make this a super-craftsmanlike job; Gibson and Glover keep their cool and charisma even when toilets fly past them. But the violence seems wildly overescalated.

PARENTHOOD (PG-13). Those with "impossible" non-haired teen-agers, whose every sentence is punctuated by a slammed door, might swear that "Parenthood" was their group portrait. And adult children of alcoholics might claim the movie as their own after watching the emotional fallout from Jason Robards' boozey, indifferent attempts at fathering (four decades later). Director Ron Howard, who also created the film's original story with Lowell Ganz and Babaloo Mandel ("Splash," "Night Shift"), uses these bittersweet elements like spelling salts, to bring us around after the laughing gas effect of the jokes. Robards and a vastly put-upon Eileen Ryan are parents of two sons: Steve Martin and young black sheep Tom Hulse, as well as two daughters: Dianne Wiest, whose husband has left her, and newcomer Harley Kozak.

TURNER AND HOOC (PG). A dog-meets-cop version of "The Odd Couple," with Tom Hanks as a picky Felix type and a jowly, drooping, pelagious Dogue de Bordeaux named Beasley as a slob Oscar. The co-stars generated some chemistry, but the issue of screenwriters have come up with a mystery story that could only be bamboozle 12-year-olds who weren't paying attention.

'Parenthood' nabs No. 1 in week's box office

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — The sitcom-fiction thriller "The Abyss" surfaced as the nation's second-favorite weekend film while "Parenthood" claimed the No. 1 spot in the box-office sweepstakes. According to figures released by Exhibitor Relations Inc., director Ron Howard's "Parenthood," an upbeat comedy starring Steve Martin and a ensemble cast, took in \$7.7 million in its second week of release, bursting the rising bubble of "The Abyss."

"The Abyss," 20th Century Fox's spectacular underwater film featuring Ed Harris and Mary Elizabeth Mastrantonio trapped on the ocean floor, collected \$9.3 million in its debut weekend. Due to the film's 2-hour, 20-minute running time, "The Abyss" had one less showing per day in many theaters, contributing to its unimpressive per-screen average of \$6,079.

The return of child-slasher Freddy Krueger brought "A Nightmare on Elm Street 5: The Dream Child" to third place in its first weekend of release. "Nightmare" grossed \$9.1 million, followed by the Tom Hanks-drooping dog police comedy "Turner and Hooch" in fourth with \$6.3 million.

The romantic comedy "When Harry Met Sally..." with Billy Crystal and Meg Ryan as busy friends who become lovers, finished in fifth with ticket sales of \$6.2 million. "Lethal Weapon 2," the police adventure sequel led by Mel Gibson and Danny Glover, ended up in sixth with receipts of \$6.1 million. Still going strong in seventh place

was "Batman," collecting \$5 million. "Batman" has now sold \$223 million worth of tickets. It was traced by the fading Sylvester Stallone prison-movie "Lock Up," in eighth with \$3.34 million.

Rounding out the Top 10 were the family comedy "Honey, I Shrunk the Kids" in ninth with \$3.63 million in ninth and the withering "Young Einstein" with \$2.1 million in 10th.

'Tour of Duty' returns to field action as ratings plunge from last season

"What a difference a decade makes," our friend The Hog-Killer has often been heard to remark. "Ten years ago, I didn't want to admit at parties I'd ever been in Vietnam. Now people come up to me and ask me what it was like."

The Hog-Killer came by his nom de guerre while serving as an infantryman. He had an unfortunate habit of punctuating the local swine population with M-16 fire while on patrol. Every time he heard a rustle in the underbrush, he'd squeeze off a burst and ask questions later. Invariably the respondent was a local porker sent early to the Great Smokehouse Up-Yonder. "What," he would ask rhetorically, "I'm supposed to risk my life to protect bacon on the hoof?" When he was discharged, the Army pointed out that his personal cost to them in Vietnamese reparations was enough to requisition a B-52 or a new refrigerator for the Pentagon.

When "Tour of Duty" premiered on CBS in 1987, it conveyed some of that sense of jumpy surrealism reflected in The Hog-Killer's story. Previous series, most notably "Combat" (1962-67), had attempted to convey the ex-

periences of men at war. But "Tour of Duty" was something different, and, to its fans, something special. It boldly announced that, just as in war, characters the audience would come to know and care about would die. It was shot in the jungle-like environs of Hawaii. These infused "Tour of Duty" with a sense of realism and high-strung jitters.

Nevertheless, "Tour of Duty" received little critical attention in its rookie season. It was left to the show's small cadre of fans to buttolhole their friends to tell them about this great new show about Vietnam.

Terence Knox held center stage as Sgt. Zeke Anderson, the savvy non-com whose only priority was getting his men out alive, sometimes defying orders to do it.

During its first season, "Tour of Duty" held its own with a key demographic: Men 18-34. But in April 1988, ABC debuted "China Beach," and everything changed. "China Beach" won the critical attention that had always eluded "Tour of Duty." That series, about the nurses and other women based in a behind-the-lines Vietnam facility, reaped the huzzahs and hosannas that some felt were "Tour of Duty"'s due all along.

The "Tour of Duty" producers took note. They moved the shooting from Hawaii to the less verdant (but more economical) environs of Southern California, and, this season, set more and more stories behind the lines or in Saigon and focused on "human interest" stories involving the soldiers and — surprise! — nurses. Army psychiatrist Dr. Seymour (Betsy Brantley) was introduced as a love interest for Anderson. To many, it seemed the show had lost its way, and the plunging ratings seemed to reflect it, although it should be noted that it was scheduled opposite ABC's "Roseanne" most of the season.

Advance word has it, however, that "Tour of Duty" will return next season to its original elements. More stories will take place in the field, and the producers have apparently elected to stick with what the series does best and let the ratings take care of themselves.

We're sure The Hog-Killer would approve.

Nicholson nets millions for 'Batman'

Q. Do you have any idea how much Jack Nicholson is earning for his role as The Joker in the hot "Batman" movie? — B.H.

A. He stands to make a record-breaking fortune. 'CNN Newsroom' promises to deliver more intelligently than 'Channel One'

HOLLYWOOD — Television news in the classroom?

It is a fine idea if made relevant and executed with care and vision.

Cable-News Network appears to have done just that with "CNN Newsroom," its weekday newscast for schoolkids that premiered Monday morning's wee hours, available for window-shopping by teachers who may want to regularly tape it and show it to their students when school resumes next month.

Based on a preview tape, the decidedly unflashy "CNN Newsroom" is vastly worthier than "Channel One," the controversial Whittle Communications newscast that played like an extended music video when introduced in a five-week trial in selected schools last spring. Tennessee-based Whittle says that the same format will apply for a full-blown national launching scheduled for March.

In September, CNN hopes to have its newscast in 1,000 schools, the same number targeted by Whittle for next year.

Meanwhile, cable's TV-in-the-classroom landscape will expand even further with the Aug. 21 start of "Short Subjects," 10-minute C-SPAN vignettes on the government and topical issues, airing on Monday nights and designed for use by high schools and colleges. And coming Sept. 18 is the Discovery Channel's

Assignment: Discovery's weekday curriculum supplements of 20-25 minutes in science, social studies and so on.

The C-SPAN and Discovery offerings bear monitoring. However, the battle to watch is between the 15-minute, commercial-free "CNN Newsroom" and the 12-minute, commercial-fraught "Channel One," which will be beamed by satellite directly into classrooms.

Under Whittle's original plan, schools would receive \$50,000 in electronic gear only if they agreed to

show "Channel One" to all their students, thereby exposing an entire student body to the commercials. However, that requirement has since been dropped by Whittle.

Far more than "Channel One," "CNN Newsroom" appears to be an excellent opportunity to make education more meaningful by turning on junior and senior high school kids to current affairs related to their school work. With this newscast, CNN has an opportunity to provide a sterling public service and, as a bonus, invest in its own future by accustoming young viewers to watch CNN.

Although the program is offered free, CNN says that there is a charge of as much as \$1 a day for a daily curriculum guide for teachers that will be furnished schools electronically upon request.

CNN has added "CNN Newsroom" to the duties of Jay Suber, executive producer of the network's "This Week in Review." Fronted by fresh young co-anchors Brian Todd and Cassandra Henderson, the new program seems understaffed with only two reporters of its own. Their stories will air with pieces from CNN's regular newscasts.

The 13 stories on the preview tape (which, CNN emphasized, was no more than a "rehearsal") ranged from brief headlines to three minutes on the impact of AIDS on teenagers. Three other stories ran two-to-three minutes—pretty hefty for TV.

"CNN Newsroom" is at once professional and, unlike "Channel One," appealingly unglorious and free of celebrity narrators, thumping music, blinding graphics and blazing neon brightness. And, of course, there are no commercials.

The inclusion of four 30-second commercials per newscast is what has made "Channel One" controversial and led to its condemnation by Bill Honig, superintendent of public instruction in California, where Gahr High School in Cerritos, Calif., was one of six schools nationwide that participated in the "Channel One" pilot project.

Echoing others objecting to commercials beamed into classrooms, Honig dismissed "Channel One" as "forced commercialization in school" and vowed that any California schools airing "Channel One" in the future would be docked state funding in accordance with the time students spent viewing the newscast.

Right decision; wrong reason. The commercials are not what's wrong with "Channel One." On the contrary, they are valuable. They should be studied in class, with students encouraged to dissect and analyze them to better understand the sophisticated selling techniques they employ.

What is wrong with "Channel One" is not commercials, only that it resembles the commercials.

The most depressing element of the "Channel One" controversy is that so many teachers publicly have expressed their support of the newscast. They have been watching too much TV.

Apparently what we are seeing is the impact of one TV generation educating another, one set of fried minds imposing their own TV-distorted perceptions on a younger set of minds, teachers feeling it is fine for their students to watch news that you can dance to.

The differences between "CNN Newsroom" and "Channel One" amount to more than just a few jeans and candy commercials. The differences amount to an entire philosophy of journalism.

The commercials are longer than most of the stories on "Channel One," which teaches students that news is indigestible unless accompanied by such TVisms as "exclusive" and a fast track of grinding music, horns, flutes and catchy titles from "Flash Back" to "Fast Fact" to "Pop Quiz."

Anchor Lynn Blades: "OK, pop quiz: What major feature did Henry Ford leave out of his first automobile?" The answer: reverse gear. OK, pop quiz: What major feature did Whittle leave out of "Channel One"? The answer: intelligence.

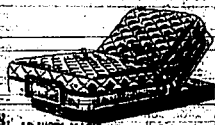

TV sportscasters play it for laughs - and groans

Viewers demand no journalism from sportscasters. And in most cases, nothing is exactly what they get.

A brief history of the genre: The early, pre-color days of television brought Phase I: sportscasting, yankals who wore crowns and bow ties as they sat in front of a camera and did little more than give the scores and regurgitate wire reports.

That was followed by the era of ex-jocks, who were hired because their reputation as athletes implied—usually falsely—that they were perceptive about the inner workings of sports. Those in sports may be the least perceptive about sports.

This dissolved into the epoch of sports buddies, when local sportscasters went out of their way to position themselves as close and loyal pals of the teams and athletes

they were supposed to be covering.

With the age of enormous rights contracts having arrived, and each side relying on the other for significant revenue, TV and sports were getting increasingly cozy and unwilling to see themselves as adversaries in any way. Nowhere was their ever-deepening, incestuous relationship more evident locally than in the proto-typical stand-up routine, consisting of the sports buddies clowning in front of the camera:

As the sportscaster tries his best to do a live report in the field, a member of the team being advertised by the sportscaster disrupts him by tugging at his pants or making faces behind his back or—when the creative urge can no longer be suppressed—pouring a soft drink on his head. The sportscaster protests and feigns frustration, but is inwardly swelling with pride and thrilled that viewers

are witnessing this expression of playful kinship that shows him as a lap dog for his news sources.

Now times demand more inventive forms. Various phases tend to overlap, of course, but many big stations are now revving up for the 1990s with a newer, livelier breed of sportscaster. He ridicules. He winks. He smirks. He mocks. He jokes. He is ... the comic.

Some explanation is in order here. There have always been sportscasters who made you laugh when they weren't trying to make you laugh. During HBO's coverage of Monday night's middleweight title fight between Michael Nunn and Iran Barkley, for example, Sugar Ray Leonard said: "This is an interesting fight so far because of the style Michael Nunn has selected to choose." A well-chosen selection of words.

On Los Angeles' KABC-AM radio recently, Stu Nahan lightheartedly noted that when the Dodgers stage their annual game with their kids, the kids somehow always win. Nahan added: "There must be some coercion going on." Or perhaps collusion.

There are comics and there are comics, however. Unlike many of their predecessors, the new

sportscasters intend to leave you smiling, their humor becoming a metaphor for the narrowing gap between TV news and entertainment.

In Los Angeles, you have to hand it to both wholesome Fred Roggin on KNBC and acerbic Keith Olbermann on KCBS-TV, who not only say funny things, but are extremely adept at assembling artfully wacky highlight packages that are almost always amusing and sometimes even hilarious.

Olbermann works largely as a solo. But with Roggin working almost back-to-back with weather wit Fritz Coleman — well, listen, you have a very funny, very breezy newscast that offers an escape from reality.
