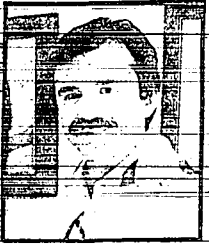

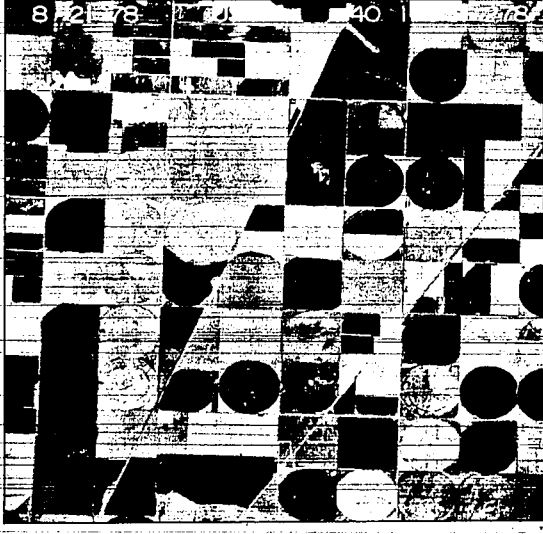

## Demos say Pheasants mayor is snub target

WASHINGTON (AP) — Angry words flew between the White House and San Francisco's city hall Thursday as the Bush administration came under attack for the second time in a month for steering clear of the Democratic mayor of a city devastated by a natural disaster.

"A publicity stunt," was how Mayor Art Agnos characterized Vice President Dan Quayle's tour of the earthquake-stricken San Francisco Bay area.

"We regret very much that the mayor of San Francisco has decided not to cooperate with us in this matter in making sure that there is adequate federal support for the disaster," White House spokesman Martin Fitzwater said.

The split between Quayle and Agnos was reminiscent of the controversy surrounding President Bush's visit to North Carolina after Hurricane Hugo.

The president bypassed Charleston despite an invitation from Democratic Mayor Joseph P. Riley Jr. Instead, Bush toured suburban Summerville, a community about 20 miles inland which was not as hard hit as the city.

Airplane rides and helicopter rides are not "everything is on the ground," Riley said. "The buildings are on the ground, the people are on the ground, the stress is on the ground and we need a president who is on the ground."

Bush flew to South Carolina eight days after Hugo devastated the Charleston area, with his administration under fire from officials including Riley and Democratic Sen. Ernest F. Hollings who said the federal government was bungling relief efforts.

Riley was left at the airport as Bush took his whirlwind tour. Republican Gov. Carroll Campbell, who was Bush's Southern campaign chairman in the last election, and Sen. Strom Thurmond, R-S.C., accompanied the president.

"The Quayle-Agnos flap erupted as Bush was preparing to fly to California on Friday to view earthquake damage."

When Fitzwater was asked if the president would meet with Agnos, the spokesman at first replied:

"The president will meet with mayors and local officials from the local area, absolutely."

"What about that mayor?" pressed reporters.

"Everyone will be invited absolutely," Fitzwater said.

A short time later, the White House announced that the mayors of San Francisco, Oakland and Alameda would accompany the president on his tour of the area.

The White House insisted that Quayle's decision to pass up a visit with Agnos was not politically motivated.

"Agnos said he was 'ticked off' by Quayle's decision not to see him separately."

Quayle and Transportation Secretary Samuel Skinner visited the Bay area on Wednesday, met with dozens of local and state officials and paved the way for Bush's visit.

**15-foot trench draws gawkers to Loma Prieta**

LOMA PRIETA, Calif. — What is being called the "biggest, deepest known gash in the earth from this week's quake has surfaced in this tiny mountain community, southwest of the quake's epicenter, and John Franberger's front yard, attracting curious scientists and drawing crowds of gawkers.

The 4-foot-wide, 15-foot-deep, 250-yard-long hole on Summit Road, about 10 miles northeast of Santa Cruz, continued to draw passersby, picture-takers and tourists to the scenic, redwood forest area on Thursday. Most stood wordless before the trench, awed by the fresh wound in the earth that was a clear sign of the quake's power.

"It's kind of a landmark, right now," said Jeff Marshall, a graduate student in earth sciences at the University of California, Santa Cruz. He said the great opening was "the most extensive ground rupture" he had seen in the area.

On Wednesday, excited seismologists and geologists began studying and measuring the opening in the ground that sliced down a long driveway shored by about six homes in the Loma Prieta neighborhood off Summit Road, miraculously missing all of them.

By Thursday, however, experts had determined that although large, the opening was not the signature of geological plate movement.

have disappeared from this area in the last few years, but I can give you an idea of the number of projects we participate in," said Brent Lierman of the Twin Falls district office of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service. "We estimate about 30 projects in Jerome County, 60 in Twin Falls County and 30 in Cassia County, and each time it destroyed an open ditch. I don't know how many other conversations took place without our participation. This is a process that's been going on for 20 years."

Simply stated, ditches provide prime pheasant habitat.

"What the ditch system did was produce a lot of cattails and willows, which is prime winter cover for pheasants," Todd explained. "The natural 'scraper' created a zone where pheasants could thrive."

Also disappearing are wide roadsides, choked with a riot of renegade vegetation. Farmers discovered they could pick up a few acres of cropland by planting up to the usual.

"Roadsides are great pheasant habitat because they provide good cover and some feed," explained Randy Smith, biologist for the Jerome office of Fish and Game. "Along with wetlands, roadsides are one of the major producers of pheasants."

When the ditches are gone and the roadsides shrink, pheasants take cover in fence rows.

"Fence rows are death traps for pheasants," Smith explained. "There isn't enough cover, and they attract predators. When you get a patch of vegetation 20, 25 feet wide or more, there's enough cover to sustain pheasants. The narrower it gets, the more efficient the predators become."

Parts of the Magic Valley have become so agriculturally "clean" — extensive sprinkler irrigation, few remaining edges, widespread fall plowing or burning — that they never again be able to support pheasants.

Eastern Twin Falls and western Cassia counties are essentially gone (for pheasant habitat), Todd said. "You find an odd bird over there, but the farming is so intense that it's eaten up every bit of habitat."

The other major change in Magic Valley agriculture that has had a profound effect on pheasant is the rapid expansion of alfalfa cultivation.

Alfalfa is a dependable cash crop, which is something Magic Valley farmers have badly needed in the past decade, and there's a growing market for hay being created by the rapidly growing dairy industry cen-

tered in Jerome County. Alfalfa does wonders for soil and for the productivity of subsequent crops and it is the pheasant's favorite habitat.

Unfortunately, for pheasants, it's harvested in June.

**Deadly first cutting**

By June, pheasant hens have nested in the best cover they can find, and around here that's alfalfa. The effect of the first cutting is devastating.

"The studies, and there are a number of them, are pretty consistent," Smith said. "It's estimated between 90 and 95 percent of pheasant nests are lost in June haying. The figures on their mortality vary a little more. One Washington study estimated 69 percent of hens were killed, but some work I did in Utah a few years ago came up with a figure of 44 percent. In any case, it's pretty high."

The surviving hens will re-nest, but often in another, as yet unharvested alfalfa field or along a fence row where the pheasant is a sitting duck.

for skunks, foxes, red-tailed hawks or grey-horned owls.

"The poor did then — she'll go to one place, and then another," Todd said. "She'll keep trying to nest as long as she is biologically able to do so."

Although the state Department of Agriculture does not keep county-by-county alfalfa production figures more than a few years old, a look at the statewide totals gives a good indication of the growth in the value of hay as a commodity.

Twenty-five years ago, Idaho harvested 3.5 million tons of hay off 1.4 million acres, with a value of \$66.7 million. By 1979, the yield was 4.1 million tons from 1.4 million acres, with a value of \$241.4 million. In 1988, the last full year for which figures are available, 3.9 million tons were harvested from 1.1 million acres, with a value of \$298.8 million.

For alfalfa hay alone, south-central Idaho harvested 1 million tons last year from 242,000 acres. In Twin Falls County, 270,000 tons were harvested from 48,500 acres. Jerome County produced 157,600

tons from 28,600 acres, Gooding County 156,300 tons from 34,600 acres, Cassia County 152,000 tons from 34,600 acres, and Minidoka County 93,500 tons from 17,200 acres.

"Losing pheasants in hay has been a problem for a long time," Rupert Mayor Bill Whitton said. "We had the same problems when I was growing up around Boise. The difference now is that there are lot more acres of alfalfa."

"One thing they've never had is an advisory watch on the first cutting of hay," said Sen. Laird Noh, R-Kimberly, chairman of the Senate Resources and Environment Committee. "I think that would help, but there has never been a system set up to do it."

Noh, who has had a long-standing interest in pheasant preservation, would like to see the agricultural extension system help communication among landowners, game managers and sportsmen.

"I think there is still quite a bit of conflict as to just what the problem is," said Dr. Charles Warren, a Rupert dentist who heads the Minidoka County chapter of Pheasants Forever.

"This has been going a long time," Noh said. "If we're going to have any success in bringing back pheasants, we'd better start figuring out how to work with each other. Otherwise, pheasants are finished."

Noh isn't alone in that concern. "Relations between landowners and sportsmen are the worst I've ever seen," Whitton said. "A lot of the problem is just a question of access. As a hunter, you can be charged with a misdemeanor for hunting without permission, but have you tried to ask permission to hunt on somebody's property who you don't know? Maybe he lives in town, maybe he lives six or seven miles down the road or maybe he owns the farm and doesn't live anywhere near it."

"Farmers see sportsmen as taking a vindictive approach," he continued. "If you don't let us hunt, we'll look you up in court or go against you when it comes time to review grazing fees."

"There's a real need for everybody involved in this to understand the whole situation," Todd said. "A landowner says to me, 'Why don't you close the pheasant season for a year?' I say, 'Fine. I'll do that if you

don't cut your alfalfa until after the fourth of July.' He says, 'I can't do that, and I say, 'Neither can I.'"

But many hunters and farmers aren't convinced the demise of the pheasant is a question of habitat.

"I think it's a combination of things," Whitton said. "I know we're losing pheasant habitat, but farmers are seeing a lot more predators. And even though there are a lot of sprinklers, I think hunting pressures have hurt about those two hard winters we had (1982-83 and 1983-84)."

"The thing you have to remember is that farmers are hunters too," he added. "We did a survey — and the No. 1 leisure-time activity was hunting."

"When I'm out at the checking station in Minidoka County, hunters tell me they didn't see any pheasants and why don't we close the season," Todd said. "I tell them, 'Come back here in January. The place looks like a white pool table. Where are the pheasants supposed to take cover for the winter?'"

Pheasants need winter cover and food, Todd's colleague Smith said. "They're not going to make it through the winter without them."

That's the purpose of the state's Habitat Improvement Program, financed by the upland game bird stamp, a 2-year-old program whose proceeds go to creating feed plots, winter cover and shelter belts. Fish and Game use money from a dedicated fund generated by stamp revenues, shares equally the cost of providing habitat with individual landowners and conservation groups.

In the Magic Valley, there are 21 upland game bird projects and several other waterfowl projects within the state's commitment of \$32,708 involving 1,438 acres. Statewide, there are 397 projects of all kinds involving 14,570 acres and \$194,314.

Those numbers are significant considering that the available federal conservation projects, including the Conservation Reserve Program embodied in the current farm bill and the other soil conservation set-aside programs administered by the ASCS, have met with relatively little acceptance in the Magic Valley on land suitable for pheasants (see accompanying story).

Two of the most notable HIP successes in the Magic Valley have been the projects it cost-shares with

the Gooding and Minidoka chapters of Pheasants Forever.

In Gooding County, Pheasants Forever plants food and winter cover plots on private farm land, ranging in size from half an acre to seven acres, and pays the landowner \$100 an acre to water and maintain it.

Last year the organization converted 850 acres to pheasant habitat; this year, because higher commodity prices have resulted in more cultivation by farmers, it has 450 acres.

"We plant grain sorghum, corn, wheat — anything that will provide food and cover," Thomas explained. "The same plots aren't necessarily planted every year, but the idea is to distribute them well enough to provide good pheasant habitat."

Thomas has found that farmers will participate if they can afford to. "If they can change something that won't affect the bottom line, they will," he said. "If you ask them to do something that will cost them \$100 or \$150 an acre, it's a different story."

Warren has had much the same experience in Minidoka County. The Rupert chapter plans tree seedlings for shelter belts, and the demand exceeds the chapter's ability to accommodate it.

"It's been rather surprising," Warren said. "It's gotten to the point where we don't have enough volunteer labor to fill all the requests we get."

The Minidoka Pheasants Forever group has planted 4,000 seedlings; a minimum of 300 trees per shelter belt. It takes a volunteer work crew a weekend to put in the trees, but the responsibility of caring for them and providing water is up to the landowner.

"Except for a couple of isolated incidents I can think of, the farmers have generally taken care of the trees," Warren said. "We've found that the success of projects goes up the more the farmers are involved."

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## Coastal states lead in income growth

WASHINGTON (AP) — Coastal states, led by the Far West, outpaced the nation in nonfarm personal income growth in the year ending in June, the Commerce Department said Thursday.

Idaho showed an 8.5 percent growth in income for the period and ranked 18th among the individual states.

That rate also exceeded the national average of 8.4 percent. It was also far ahead of the 7.5 percent growth recorded for the other states in the Rocky Mountain region — Colorado, Utah, Montana and Wyoming — which ranked last among the seven regions.

The interior states advanced more slowly than the U.S. average.

The department's Bureau of Economic Analysis said the Far West's nonfarm income grew 9.6 percent from the second quarter of 1988 to the same period this year. The region's income growth was bolstered by strength

in construction and manufacturing, particularly aircraft production.

The Boeing Co. is headquartered in Washington state and the Douglas Aircraft Division of McDonnell-Douglas Corp. is in California.

The growth rate in the Far West was 1.2 percentage points above the U.S. average of 8.4 percent, the bureau said.

In each of the other coastal regions, however, growth was only somewhat above the national average — up 8.7 percent in the Southeast, 8.6 percent in New England and 8.5 in the Mid-Atlantic.

Nonfarm personal incomes in the interior states advanced only 7.5 percent, pulled down in large part by poor growth in the Plains states and barely keeping above the 5.3 percent inflation rate for the 12 months ending in June.

## Modest inflation soothes markets

WASHINGTON (AP) — Consumer prices rose an unexpectedly modest 0.2 percent in September, the government said Thursday, soothing frazzled financial markets, which took the report as an indication the Federal Reserve Board has room to lower interest rates.

Inflation, which had been raging at a 6.7 percent annual rate from January through May, has now abated to a 4.4 percent rate for the first nine months of the year, the same as in both 1988 and 1987 and well under the Bush administration's 1989 inflation projection of 5 percent.

Michael Boskin, chief economic adviser at the White House, called the report "good economic news."

"We're delighted to be able to say that, while we're always on guard to make sure that inflation remains under control, the concern earlier in the year that inflation was getting out of control appears to have been unfounded," he said.

The seasonally adjusted increase in the Labor Department's Consumer Price Index follows no gain at all in August and similarly modest 0.2 percent rises in July and June.

— Although private economists said

inflation was likely to pick up in the fourth quarter, jittery stock and bond markets rallied on Thursday's news.

Interpreting it as a sign the Federal Reserve likely will hedge interest rates lower.

By midafternoon, the Dow Jones industrial average had risen more than 40 points.

Because of the stock market turmoil set off by the Friday late November, the Fed has eased a key interest rate from about 9 percent to 8.75 percent. Analysts predicted

another quarter-point decline soon in the rate charged between banks for overnight loans.

In an effort to contain inflation, the Fed has been using high interest rates to slow the economy. Although wholesale-price inflation shot up 0.9 percent in September, other statistics for the month portray a sluggish economy with weakening manufacturing employment, industrial production and housing construction.

## Senate expected to pass new capital gains plan

WASHINGTON (AP) — A new plan to cut capital-gains taxes and expand Individual Retirement Accounts was introduced Thursday with the support of a majority of senators and the Bush administration.

Sen. Bob Packwood, R-Ore., who with Sen. Bill Roth, R-Del., wrote the bill, told reporters he expects it to become law this year.

A solid majority of the House already has voted for a capital-gains reduction that carried the endorsement of President Bush, but that proposal did not affect IRAs. The Senate version does not include the capital-gains provision.

The Roth-Packwood bill would:

- Exclude from taxation up to 35 percent of individual capital gains, which are profits from the sale of stock and other investments. The longer an asset were held, the less it would be taxed. Five percent of the gain from the sale of assets owned more than one year would be excluded; if the asset were held more than seven years, 35 percent of

the gain would be excluded.

As an option, an investor could exclude from taxation any gain caused solely by inflation.

Present law fully taxes capital gains, just as it does wages and salaries.

- Cut the tax rate on corporate capital gains, now 34 percent, to as low as 29 percent.
- Permit individuals to set aside up to \$2,000 a year in an IRA, increasing to \$3,000 a year after five years. There would be no tax deduction on the contribution; instead, the contribution and interest it earned could be withdrawn tax-free for retirement, paying for a college education, medical expenses or buying a first home.
- The plan would permit workers who in the past have made tax-deductible contributions to an IRA to "roll over" those accounts into one of the new types in order to become eligible for tax-free withdrawals for education, medical expenses or homebuying.

## Accused spy to be held without bail

ALEXANDRIA, Va. (AP) — A former military communications officer charged with passing classified materials to the Soviets was ordered held without bail Thursday despite his lawyer's contention he did nothing wrong and just wanted "some excitement in his life."

Magistrate W. Curtis Sewell said

the case against Frank Nesbitt, 44, will be sent to a grand jury. FBI agents arrested Nesbitt last week at a hotel in McLean, Va., and charged him with delivering and attempting to deliver unauthorized information to agents of the Soviet Union.

Sewell said he found a "preponderance of evidence" to hold Nesbitt.

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

## Midwest storm dumps 6 inches of snow

Trees in autumnal technicolor of crimson and gold turned suddenly white Thursday after a storm blitzed the Midwest with up to 6 inches of snow, causing power outages to more than 175,000 customers in Ohio, Indiana and Michigan.

It was the earliest snowfall on record for many cities, including Cincinnati, Dayton, Ohio, Indianapolis and St. Louis. At least one death was attributed to the storm.

In many places, the snow followed unusually balmy weekend weather in the upper 70s and low 80s.

"I can't believe this," said Jan. Fredbeck of Franklin, Ind., where 6 inches of snow fell. "We've got Halloween decorations up inside and they look so stupid now."

Some 100,000 Cincinnati-area customers were without power Thursday as the wet, heavy snow piled up on the leaf-laden trees, causing them to break and fall on power lines. Cincinnati Gas & Electric Co. spokesman Bruce Stoeckel said he expects service to be restored by Thursday night.

About 20,000 Akron-area customers were affected by outages, said Ohio Edison spokesman Ralph DiNicola. Another 20,000 customers without electricity in the Dayton area should have power by morning, said Dayton Power & Light Co. spokesman Allen Hill.

Toledo Edison Co. spokesman Jim Proctor said 19,000 customers

were without electricity Thursday afternoon and the number was growing. He said snowbound branches continued to fell power lines throughout the day.

"As soon as we get it fixed in one place, we're having to send crews out to somewhere else," he said.

Schools were closed in much of the state as 3 to 5 inches of snow fell in southwestern Ohio and 1 to 3 inches of snow was reported elsewhere in the state.

A Covington, Ohio, man was killed when his car veered into the opposite lane of a snow-slickened state highway and struck a pickup truck near Dayton, said Patty Carey of the Ohio Highway Patrol. The area had received 2 inches of snow.

A National Weather Service forecaster said records dating back to about 1870 show no snowfall in Cincinnati as early as Oct. 19.

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — A healthy Galileo spacecraft sped unerringly toward distant Jupiter on Thursday, while the five orbiting astronauts who released it measured the threatened ozone layer that is Earth's natural sunscreen.

Racing along at more than 9,000 mph, the probe by midafternoon was more than 200,000 miles out on its 2.4-billion-mile, six-year journey to study the largest planet in the solar system in a search for clues to how the universe began.

Galileo was dispatched from Atlantis' cargo bay Wednesday night, 6 1/2 hours after the shuttle was launched from Cape Canaveral. NASA officials reported Thursday the craft was

in "perfect shape" and "right on course."

Atlantis also was pronounced in "excellent condition" by Mission Control after the crew members successfully restored a cooling system that shut down Wednesday when it overheated and cut in a backup unit.

Mission Control awakened the space travelers Thursday with a musical tribute to Atlantis' commander Don Williams and pilot Mike McCulley, both naval aviators and graduates of Purdue University.

Played were "Hail Purdue" and "Anchors Aweigh," with reveille sandwiched in between. The other crew members are Ellen Baker, Franklin Chang-Diaz and Shannon Lucid.

## General: Short funds cause huddle

WASHINGTON (AP) — The commander of the U.S. and allied forces in Europe, Gen. John Galvin, said Thursday that budget pressures force the nation's military chiefs to haggle over Pentagon spending in discussions that resemble Aztec "bloodletting ceremonies."

Galvin, who is the Supreme Allied Commander in Europe and the commander-in-chief of the U.S.

European Command, spoke of the internal negotiations that go on among the nation's highest military leaders as they grapple with budget cuts.

For the past five years, the Pentagon has had to deal with declining funds.

The four-star general was asked at a meeting with reporters to address the issue.

## Medicaid abortion limits eased

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate sent President Bush on Thursday a bill permitting federally financed abortions for poor women who are victims of rape or incest, ignoring the president's pledge to veto the measure.

The bill, which has assumed symbolic importance in the larger political war over the abortion issue, would ease an eight-year-old restriction on circumstances in which Medicaid will pay for a poor woman's abortion.

The Senate's 67-31 vote provided final congressional passage of a spending bill including the key provision on abortion, which the House approved in a surprise vote last week. The Senate previously had approved broadening federal funding for abortions, and its last vote would have needed to send the bill to the White House.

The measure would allow federal money to be spent on abortions for poor women who are victims of rape or incest and who "reported promptly" to law enforcement or public health authorities.

Although the measure has become the object of intense effort by both sides of the abortion issue, there was little Senate discussion of abortion as it came to the floor.

Sen. Brock Adams, D-Wash., said Bush's promise of a veto was "unconscionable" and would "cause enormous additional suffering" for poor victims of rape or incest.

"The president has told us he will veto this bill because he won't accept language that allows poor rape and incest victims access to abortions," he said. "I'm sorry the president of the United States, the most powerful man in the world, has

## Dependents may be leaving Panama faster

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Bush administration may speed up the planned withdrawal of U.S. military dependents from Panama, the White House said Thursday.

Gen. Maxwell R. Thurman, the newly appointed U.S. military commander in Panama, also has recommended shortening soldiers' tour of duty so that fewer bring their families to Panama, a Pentagon official said.

The United States has been trying without success to oust strongman Gen. Manuel Antonio Noriega, who has held onto power in Panama after nullifying last year's election results there and installing his own president.

U.S. officials last May began evacuating military dependents, and as of July 1, some 6,300 Department of Defense personnel had either been sent home or relocated onto U.S. bases in Panama, White House spokesman Marlin Fitzwater said.

But there are still roughly 11,000 American dependents in the country, said Fitzwater, who added, "We are reviewing the issue right now of whether or not that (withdrawal) should be accelerated."

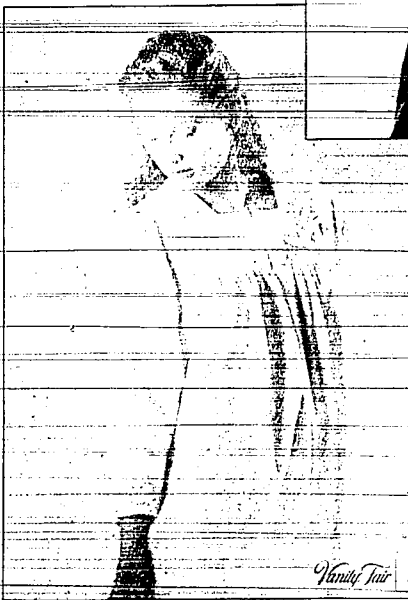
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## World Czech cops raid meet, arrest 14

VIENNA, Austria (AP) — Police in Prague raided an international meeting on human rights Thursday, arresting Czechoslovakia's former foreign minister and 14 other activists, and briefly detaining a leading U.S. human rights monitor.

It was the fourth such crackdown on independent activists in Czechoslovakia in recent days, indicating Prague has no intention of following Poland and Hungary into genuine dialogue with opposition groups.

Detained briefly was Jeri Laber, an American who directs U.S. Helsinki Watch, which is associated with the Vienna-based International Helsinki Federation. Ms. Laber, the only foreign national detained, was released after a document check.

Former Foreign Minister Jiri Hajek and 14 other activists were arrested at the federation's office. Hajek and activist Rita Klimova were released in late afternoon and allowed to return home, an emigre source said. Another activist, Josef Danisz, had been set free earlier in the day.

Dissident playwright Vaclav Havel and another leading activist, Vaclav Malý, escaped the police dragnet because those detained shouted warnings to them to flee, the federation said.

The Communist Party daily Rude Pravo also has warned that anybody taking part in street demonstrations marking the Oct. 28 anniversary of Czechoslovak independence in 1918 faces prosecution.

## More protests in E. Germany appear likely

BERLIN (AP) — Protesters may fill East German streets again unless the new leader, Egon Krenz, betrays his hard-line record and begins the kind of reforms under way elsewhere in the Soviet bloc, pro-democracy activists said Thursday.

Krenz made clear almost immediately after replacing Erich Honecker on Wednesday that the Communist Party would resist the democratic trends evident in Poland and Hungary.

"Krenz stands for the continuation of neo-Stalinist politics," said Reinhard Schult, a founder of New Forum, the largest pro-democracy group in East Germany.

Speaking on RIAS radio in West Berlin, he said Krenz "did not have one word to say about the causes of the current crisis and made no offer for talks with the opposition."

Author Rolf Schneider, a critic of the government, told RIAS: "The crisis will keep dragging on."  
A Lutheran church leader said privately "the demonstrations will start again soon" unless the government changes its course. The church has been in the forefront of reform efforts in East Germany.

## Spanish writer receives Nobel

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) — Camilo Jose Cela, a Spanish writer whose violent, grotesque images sprang from the civil war that killed more than 1 million of his countrymen, won the Nobel Prize for literature on Thursday.

The Swedish Academy cited Cela, 73, for "rich and intense prose which with restrained compassion forms a challenging vision of man's vulnerability."

It said his novel "The Family of Pascual Duarte," published in 1942, was the most popular work of fiction in Spanish since Miguel Cervantes' masterpiece "Don Quixote" was published nearly 400 years ago.

"I understand that this is the culmination of my literary career after many years of work," Cela told Swedish radio from his home in Guadafajara, 30 miles northeast of Madrid.

## Jet crash kills 57

MOSCOW (AP) — A military transport plane carrying paratroopers to keep order in the ethnically torn southern republic of Azerbaijan lost an engine and crashed in the Caspian Sea, killing all 57 people aboard, it was reported Thursday.

The left engine of the Ilyushin-76 plane caught fire minutes after it took off from an unidentified airport in the Azerbaijani part of the Caucasus Military District, Izvestia said.

Tass did not say more precisely where or when the crash occurred.

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# Nation Briefly

### Appeals panel hears money case

MOSCOW (AP) — Should a criminal sentence depend at least in part on the fact that the crime involved a large amount of money? That was the question posed to the Idaho Court of Appeals Wednesday in an appeal from Oskar and Darlene Cromer of Lewiston. The couple contended their jail sentences were excessive after they admitted burning their Twin Falls home to collect \$168,000 insurance.

The case, one of a series of appeals being heard by the court this week, was taken under advisement.

Lewiston attorney Thomas Callery said the Cromers strongly believe the sentences from 2nd District Judge Ron Schilling were excessive. They pressed an appeal even though they have served their time, he said.

The Cromers were convicted of grand theft in July, 1988, for burning down their home to claim their insurance company.

Oskar Cromer, a construction worker, was sentenced to one year in jail and served 10 months. Darlene Cromer, former Lewiston School District employee, was sentenced to six months and served five months.

Both also were sentenced to 10 years probation and must pay \$168,000 restitution.

### Woman pleads innocent in death

GRANDEVILLE (AP) — A Peck woman accused of running over and killing an Idaho County sheriff's deputy last month has pleaded innocent to three felony charges.

Beve Hallberg, 26, appeared Thursday before 2nd District Judge Reinhardt, who accepted her plea and ordered her bond continued at \$50,000. She was returned to the Lewis County Jail in Nezperce in lieu of bond.

Reinhardt was disqualified from the case earlier at the request of Ms. Hallberg's attorney, Doug Moshitz of Lewiston, but was allowed to preside at Thursday's arraignment.

Second District Judge John Bengtson will preside at Ms. Hallberg's trial, but no date has been set.

### Emergency phone system on track

POCATELLO (AP) — Work is on scheduled for Dec. 1 completion of the 911 emergency telephone system. Bannock County voters approved last November.

"Right now, we've got people out in the field dialing in (on a special text number) and we're verifying that the data is correct," Larry Henrie, a telecommunications specialist installing the system, said Thursday.

With the enhanced computer system, a caller's address and phone number will be immediately displayed before county dispatchers. Henrie said special needs of handicapped residents also will be linked to the addresses and telephone numbers, and will be displayed on dispatchers' computer screens.

### 1st doctoral grad founds business

POCATELLO (AP) — Idaho State University developed its research park with an eye toward recruiting businesses that would transfer technology from university research, work hand-in-hand with its faculty in developing new products and give the region an economic boost.

This week, the Pocatello school scored on all three counts. Advanced ImmunoAssays, an offshoot of a Kansas City, Mo.-based diagnostic laboratory founded by ISU's first doctoral graduate, officially opened its doors at the research park Wednesday.

The company's first product will be a kit to diagnose yeast infections; it will occupy 1,500-square feet in the university's Business and Technology Building.

The company initially will employ two people.

# State education board backs huge aid hike

SANDPOINT (AP) — The Idaho Board of Education has unanimously endorsed an ambitious 14.7 percent hike in state aid to public schools for the 1990-1991 school year and the diversion of over half the record state cash surplus to a public education trust fund.

State Schools Superintendent Jerry Evans, outlining on Thursday the proposed \$58.1 million increase in state support along with diversion of at least \$36 million from the surplus, said the public is demanding that children be well educated and not placed at a disadvantage when competing with their counterparts in other states.

"In light of the continued interest by the public for the improvement of schools and the current economy, I think our changes are very, very good," the proposed budget blueprint director said before receiving substantial support.

Boostered by the dramatic growth of the state's economy since 1987, Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus and

Republican legislative leaders have indicated interest in maintaining the state's escalating financial commitment to education that yielded a near-record \$38.3 million increase in aid for this year. But neither has suggested support for a budget proposal as large as the one backed by the board. It totaled \$52.4 million.

"Significant changes were accomplished as a result of that \$38.3 million increase, Evans said. "But we've only taken the first step with last year's budget. I plan to use that to build a case for phase one."

Evans will now consider the proposal as he begins putting his own overall budget blueprint together for presentation to lawmakers in January. With state aid to schools accounting for over half of annual general tax spending, the plan put together by Evans and lawmakers will require a \$1-billion pushed-budget request to the governor well over \$900 million and toward the \$1 billion mark.

Current economic reports from the

state indicate tax receipts during the next budget year will likely run between \$850 million and \$960 million, and based on past actions that would only be enough to sustain a public school budget of less than \$440 million without cutting money for other programs.

Evans' proposal, which would increase state aid per student from \$1,700 to \$1,950, includes the first step of a four-year plan to close the gap between average Idaho teacher salaries, now ranked 44th nationally, and the national average along with a second phase of a school improvement program launched last year. That program earmarks millions of dollars to achieve specific goals like reduced class sizes and updating equipment, materials and curriculum.

After holding shut to achieve so-called salary parity for teachers in 1984, the legislature has seen a drop, and Evans said that has taken its toll on Idaho's teaching corps.

"With high standards but low salaries, he said districts are having

more and more trouble attracting and retaining quality teachers, especially in subject areas where shortages are beginning to develop.

"Their choices are to pursue other areas of study or, if they enter teacher preparation programs, to look in neighboring states for employment," Evans said.

Reaching the national average salary today, he said, would take over \$82 million. His plan calls for making up a quarter of that gap in the new budget, a third of the remaining difference in the next. The disparity between that point would be cut in half in the third year with equity achieved in the 1993-1994 school year. The gap would be adjusted annually to reflect increases in the national average.

Idaho's average salary was just over \$22,700 last year while the national average stood at more than \$27,000.

The request was similar to the one the coalition submitted a year ago, although that plan left the issue of teacher salaries to the Legislature.

# State workers pleased with merit pay system

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Legislature tried a new approach to state pay raises for state employees.

Instead of automatic raises, the Legislature directed state agencies to grant employees pay hikes based on performance, except for special circumstances.

Directors of state agencies told a legislative committee Thursday they like the system, and it appears to have improved employee morale.

"It must be working. My telephone has stopped ringing," said Rep. Pam Bengson, R-Boise. She headed an ongoing legislative committee on personnel matters, and said since the new system was adopted, the number of calls she gets from unhappy state employees has dropped substantially.

The Legislature directed state agencies to evaluate employees with the goal of granting 5 percent raises to workers who were doing satisfactory work. The raises were aimed at rewarding "solid, mainstream, responsible" performance instead of only outstanding performance.

Lawmakers also said if employees don't get at least satisfactory ratings, they probably should be terminated. A report from state Personnel Director Richard Hutehison said of the 9,900 classified state employees, about two-thirds received 5 percent pay raises. As of June 11, only 372 employees received no increase.

Others had pay increased because they completed probationary periods or job evaluations were changed.

Only 30 of the 9,900 classified employees received raises of more than 12.5 percent. Of those, most were in Health and Welfare and Employment. Six of Employment's 482 classified employees received raises up to 15 percent, said personnel administrator Jane Daly.

Rep. Ed Brown, R-Pocatello, co-chairman of Thursday's hearing, said he's received complaints, but there does not appear to be any trend. "I'm impressed with how the agencies have moved to implement the spirit of the new law, he said.

# State officer cited for spotlighting deer

COTTONWOOD (AP) — An Idaho State Police officer has been cited for illegally spotlighting a deer in a decoy operation of the state Fish and Game Department.

Joseph Arzen, a State Police corporal at Nezperce, faces charges in Idaho County Magistrate Court of attempting to kill a deer with the aid of artificial light.

Arzen was accused of firing at a stuffed deer that had been placed along the Rice Creek Grade south of Cottonwood. Fish and Game officers placed the decoy deer in the area early Wednesday morning in response to complaints about hunters trespassing, shooting from the road and spotlighting deer to freeze them in their tracks.

Conservation Officer M. Bruce Palmer said a Kamiah man, Junior Mendonhall, was the first person cited after he stopped his vehicle and fired one shot at the deer.

Less than a half hour later, Palmer said, Arzen drove past the decoy, turned his vehicle to put the headlights on it and then fired nine shots into the stuffed deer.

Arzen's brother Guy, a Nez Perce County sheriff's deputy, was a passenger in the vehicle but was not charged in connection with the incident.

# Hospital posts profit for the year

COUNCIL (AP) — Council Community Hospital has survived a threatened closure last spring to post a year-end profit, administrator Norton Howell says.

Although a report for the fiscal year that ended Sept. 30 will not be available until month's end, Howell estimated the west-central Idaho hospital would show a profit of about \$10,000.

An increase of about \$146,000 in revenues is projected for this year.

"It's one again viable," Howell said Wednesday. "That means we're starting to operate in the black."

The facility is seeing some minor hikes in patient charges, he said. The number of patients have increased and employees took a temporary 10 percent pay cut at the 121-bed hospital in the logging town 130 miles north of Boise.

"With all of those factors, and then with the continuing support of the patients and the community, she's come back on line," said Howell, of Lutheran Hospitals and Home Systems, a North Dakota-based company that took over management last spring.

But hospital board member Larry Derie sees the upturn as a result of community involvement.

"I believe that the (management) company is doing a good job, as far as I can see," he said. But he added, "The reason we're in the black is because of the fund drive."

A last-ditch fund drive last spring raised more than \$150,000 in seven days, including corporate donations and a Council resident who pledged his home.

Adams County owns the hospital building and its equipment and leases it to a hospital taxing district for \$1 a year.

The problems at Council Community Hospital are the same as those at rural hospitals nationwide: low Medicare reimbursement, empty beds, modern but expensive technology, and a shortage of health professionals.

The facility has increased its respiratory therapy and out-patient lab services. It also intends to offer home health care and add a third physician.

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
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

# Jerome City Council begins hunt for new building inspector

JEROME - The City Council is searching for a new building inspector.

Council decided Tuesday to begin advertising immediately for someone qualified to fill the position, which was vacated last month when Jim Jurgens resigned to work with the state Department of Agriculture.

The council hopes to find a full-time employee who split duties between building inspector and general maintenance person. The individual might also be asked to serve as a contact person between the city and the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Councilman Don Jacobson noted that it may be difficult to find someone qualified to fulfill all these

duties. "He will have to be a certified building inspector, run planning and zoning and administer zoning ordinances," said Jacobson. "If we can find someone to fit, that's fine."

The interview process should be fairly extensive, he added.

Council discussed the possibility of sharing an employee with the county, but Councilman Rocky Jackson said he believes there could be some conflicts between city and county duties.

Jacobson agreed that it could be difficult to keep city and county ordinances appropriately separated.

Kirk Hansen, who works part-time for the county, is an interim building inspector.

In other council business, Fire Chief Jim Auclair obtained permission to order up to \$2,000 worth of parts to use in overhauling

and rebuilding a fire department truck. The project is not related to the desire by some that the city still needs a new fire truck. The truck has needed repairs for some time, the department said.

Council agreed to pay \$60 to send one as yet unnamed fire department employee to an arson investigators' seminar in Twin Falls Nov. 7-9.

Councilman Gerald Oster reported that the tree committee he is chairing has ordered \$75 worth of trees to be shipped to the city in the spring.

Council approved a wine license for El Sombroero, pending the establishment's proof of receipt of state-and-county licenses.

Council approved the purchase of \$1,160 worth of repair and maintenance parts for the city sweeper.

# Minidoka School Board votes to require more credits by '91

PAUL - Seniors in Minidoka County will need more credits to graduate, beginning in 1991.

The School Board voted Monday

to increase graduation requirements to 46 in 1991 and to 48 thereafter. Currently, seniors need 44 credits to graduate. But students can earn a possible 59 credits under the trimester system begun this year. Of these, 45 credits can be earned at the high school and 14 credits earned in the ninth grade, if the junior highs were to change to the trimester system also, students could earn up to 60 credits in 4 years, Minidoka Principal Steve Hubsmith said.

The increases parallel college entrance requirements in Idaho. The district allows some flexibility in the new requirements, Superintendent Gene Snapp said. "Anyone someone gets close and there are extenuating circumstances, we take that into consideration."

Trustee Russ Holland added that there are other ways to get credits now like correspondence courses

and the alternative school.

In other matters, the Minidoka teacher-of-the-year will be East Minico math teacher Gwen Fennell, Snapp said. Fennell was chosen from among colleagues who were nominated in each school.

The district pays annual membership fees for each school's teacher-of-the-year - for the Association of Supervision and Curriculum Development. The teachers also are invited to attend various workshops throughout the year.

As an additional incentive this year, the board voted to award \$250 to each teacher honored and \$750 to the district's teacher-of-the-year.

"I really think we should show our appreciation to our excellent teachers," Trustee Warren Snyder said.

Minidoka schools were recently recognized by the federal government for its hot lunch program, Marie Stauffer, school lunch supervisor, told the board.

Minidoka was one of eight schools chosen out of 50 Idaho school districts based on such criteria as low meal prices, student participation and nutrition education, she said.

Minidoka lunch prices are fifth lowest in the state, Stauffer said.

In other business, the trustees:

- Heard a report from Snapp that Minidoka schools may soon use the services of a drug detecting dog.
- Discussed the additional

classroom space that will be needed for Paul Elementary School next year, particularly for a kindergarten and an additional sixth-grade class.

• Gave permission for Minico drill team members to begin fundraisers to earn money to attend the Sea World Holiday Bowl in San Diego in December 1990.

• Offered a contract to Terry Weigand to teach seventh- and eighth-grade math, language arts, science and social studies to relieve teacher loads at West Minico Junior High.

• Increased the salary for Driver Education instructors by .50 cents per hour.

• Approved a home schooling request from Randall and Pamela Richards.

• Approved Kent VanTassel as a volunteer assistant for the Minico wrestling program.

• Discussed an Interagency Agreement with the Region 5 Adult and Child Development Center to provide for the education of 3- to 5-year-old handicapped children. Such instruction has recently been mandated by the state.

• Listed to a report given by Heyburn teacher Donna Burch concerning a two-week NASA Johnson Space Center Workshop she attended in Houston last summer. Burch was one of 23 elementary teachers from eight western states to attend the all-expenses paid workshop.

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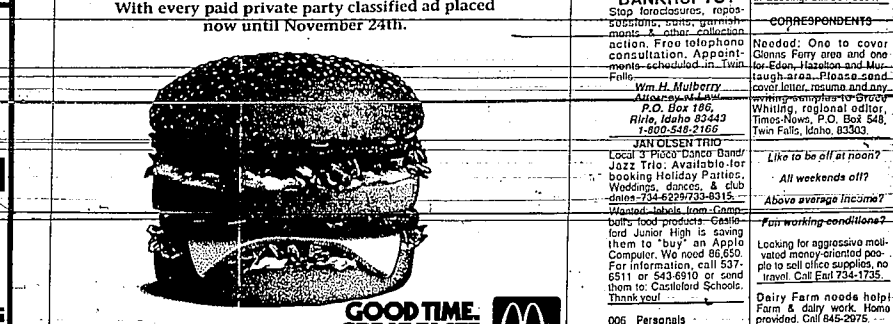

The toughest time for a declarer to ward-off-complacency is after a favorable ad presents him with a free trick. Today's example demonstrates what can happen to one who takes too much for granted.

South won his spade jack, happy to get a "free" gift. Seeing no road-hocks-ahead, South led a club to dummy's queen, holding the trick. South led a low heart back to his king to repeat the club play, but this time dummy's king lost to East's ace. East returned a spade to South's ace, and South tried a low heart, intending to take the deception finesse of dummy's 10. West saw through this maneuver and rose with his jack to deny dummy that vital extra entry. Now there was no way to win nine tricks.

South makes his game if he refuses to be piggy on dummy's club suit. Instead of leading the first club to dummy's queen, he should buy insurance and put in dummy's eight instead. East must win his 10, and regardless of how the defense continues, South now has a virtually certain entry to dummy's clubs, allowing him to win at least nine tricks.

"At first Kimberly was doing the singing and the group was called 'The Waves,'" explained drummer Alex Cooper, the band's one-time tour guide. "But once Katrina started singing, we became 'Katrina and the Waves.'" Someone said "we'd get more dates at the military camps because the soldiers will come out for a girl's name."

Military camps are important because both Cooper and Leskanich grew up in military families that traveled all over the world. Leskanich alone has lived in England, Germany, the Netherlands, Nebraska, Massachusetts, California, Georgia and Kansas.

renting of computer programs without the explicit permission of the copyright owner.

Unfortunately, this bill meant to stop software piracy, would also apply to video games. The Video Software Dealers Association has proposed an amendment to the bill to exclude video games because they cannot be copied. One is that they believe the rental of games has hindered consumers

who want to buy tapes from doing so because the supply of games are being bought up by the rental stores.

But perhaps the biggest complaint the games manufacturers have with the prospect of renting is that they do not make any money on the rentals.

So the battle rages on. The rental people have the advantage of precedent. Long ago they won the fight over the right to rent videocassettes. The president of the VSDA, Rick Karpel, has promised that game rentals will not die easily. "We're making phone calls. If we can mobilize our customers, we'll win." Only time will tell.

# ABC's 'Young Riders' helps make Western splash this fall TV season

They rode hard. They rode fast. They rode straight into a lawsuit. But otherwise, "The Young Riders" are riding along just fine.

In fact, the debut of this new ABC series about six orphaned young Pony Express riders marks the first time in 15 years that there is more than one Western on the fall TV schedule. And while "The Young Riders," along with CBS's "Paradise," might not constitute a Western wave, it at least seems to be making a splash.

"Yeah, that's right," draws the amiable Josh Brolin, who plays the teen-age James Butler ("Wild Bill") Hickok. "I don't know if we're, like, a trend or anything. I just know I like doin' this. Except for the horses, man," he adds, half-jokingly. "The horses are makin' me sore!"

Brolin actually grew up around horses on the ranch of his father, James Brolin ("Hole"), outside Tempe, Calif. Not so his co-stars Anthony Zerbe, Gregg Rainwater, Travis Fine, Yvonne Suhor, Ken Jenkins, Melissa Leo, Steve Baldwin (as a young, fictionalized version of the real-life "Buffalo Bill" Cody) and Ty Miller as the enigmatic youth called "The Kid." But saddle sores may be the least of their troubles.

It seems that Morgan Creek Pro-

ductions, the company behind the 1988 Western film "Young Guns," considered the new show a bit too close to the movie for their liking. A lawsuit filed in Los Angeles Federal Court claims that the TV show borrows liberally from their own tale of six young guns-for-hire in the Old West. (Curiously, Morgan Creek made no mention of the 1958 Western movie called — hmmm — "The Young Guns.")

In reply, "The Young Riders" creator and supervising producer Ed Spielman told the court his series was based on his own 1971 short story "On the Plains" and that his pilot script first interested executive producers Josh Kane and Michael Oglens in 1982. At last reckoning, all parties still seemed headed for a shootout at the L.A. corral.

The show's title actually had been changed at the last minute from its original name, "The Kid." Brolin calls the switch "a smart move, from a business standpoint. You hear: 'The Kid,' and it sounds like it's about just one guy. But I don't particularly like (the title) 'Young Riders,'" he confesses, "because it sounds too much like 'Young Guns' or 'The Long Riders.'" ("The Long Riders" was a

1980 Western starring the Carradine, Keach and Quaid brothers as the real-life Younger, James and Miller brothers.)

Whatever you call it, the new show is different from the formulaic, mythologized West of TV and the movies. Brolin, for instance, does not see Hickok as a younger version of the white-hat character played by Gary Cooper in "The Plainsman" or Roy Rogers in "Young Bill Hickok." "He killed a lot of people," Brolin says of the gun-happy gambler who served as a Civil War scout and a town marshal before being ambushed at age 39 by a paid assassin in 1876. "He really was involved with the Pony Express," Brolin continues, "but there's not too much written about that." While the series is by no means a docudrama, he adds, a conscious effort is being made to make this show more realistic than Westerns of the past.

Publicity prevailing at that time insisted that Rathbone's fictional character was loosely based on Irving Berlin.

**A:** The Bette-genius connection came about because of what was written in a new book, mostly of photographs, by actor Roddy McDowall. He asked friends and various celebs to write about their favorite performers, with McDowall photographing the notable choices. Among the 115 in the glossy book was Midler,

praised by none other than the late Sir Laurence Olivier, who said, "Bette Midler must be as near to being a genius as makes no matter."

**Q:** Please settle this argument. Just how long has Gregory Peck been in show business? — J.N.

**A:** It's just 50 years ago that Peck, now in "Old Gringo" with Jane Fonda, set out to conquer Broadway. He had a letter of introduction to a business friend of his father's. The letter got him his first "entertainment" — as a Barker at a concession his father's friend had just bought in the amusement zone at the 1939 World's Fair!

**Q:** I've been reading a lot about a film from Europe called "The Bear," which is based on a novel by an American writer. I'd like to get the book, but I can't seem to find it anywhere. — G.K.

**A:** The original story, by James Oliver Curwood, has been out of print in this country for many years — but publisher Esther Margolis has scored the literary coup of the year for her Newmarket Press. She won reprint rights to the original Curwood novel, written 75 years ago, plus rights to "The Odyssey of the Bear," which tells the story of the making of the film by director Jean-Jacques Annaud. "The Bear," the incredible \$22 million movie of

two bears, an orphaned cub and a 2,000-pound wounded kodiak, has already grossed over \$90 million in box offices in Europe and the Far East.

**Q:** One of the oddities of the recent TV production of Tennessee Williams' drama, "Sweet Bird of Youth," starring Elizabeth Taylor and Mick Hannon, was the casting of Rip Torn in the role of the corrupt Boss Finley. Didn't Torn play this very same character in the movie original? — H.P.

**A:** You're only partially on target. Torn did indeed appear in the film, but it wasn't in the identical part (after all, that was a good 27 years ago). For the record, Torn played the role of Finley's vengeful son in that version.

**Q:** Isn't it true that Bruce Willis has put on a lot of weight lately? Does he have a problem? — S.P.

**A:** Bruce admits to putting on the poundage — all for the sake of his craft, he insists. In his latest movie, "In Country," he plays a Vietnam vet who has let himself go. To look the part, Willis went on a high-calorie diet. Ironically, Bruce tells me he played the role of the beefy veteran because he wanted to "stretch. I had gotten lazy on TV." # ABC's World Series coverage halts NBC's winning streak in ratings race

LOS ANGELES — ABC put an end to NBC's long domination of the ratings with its broadcasts of the first two games of the San Francisco Bay-area World Series.

NBC fell behind ABC in the Nielsen ratings for the week ended Oct. 15 after an unprecedented winning streak of 68 weeks. In all, NBC has been the No. 1 network for four years.

Neither Saturday's game nor Sunday's game between the San Francisco Giants and the Oakland Athletics was in the Top 10. In fact, neither won its time period. But they had enough viewers to put ABC into first place.

ABC won the A.C. Nielsen Co. survey with an average of 14.8. NBC was second with 13.9 and CBS third with 12.5; according to CBS, ABC's interpretation of the ratings gave NBC 13.8 and NBC gave itself 14.0. A ratings point represents the percentage of the 92.1 million television homes. A share is the percentage of the sets in use.

"I'm sorry it's come to an end," Brandon Tartikoff, president of NBC Entertainment, said in an earlier interview, "but I hope we start a new streak soon."

ABC's "Roseanne" was the top-rated show of the week and the network had three other series in the Top 10. NBC had five shows at the top and CBS had one.

Saturday's opening game of the World Series was tied for 18th place with ABC's "Doogie Howser, M.D." The Sunday game was 16th.

It appeared likely that ABC also would win the current week with additional Series games.

# Cable News Network pulls plug on unchallenged commentaries

NEW YORK — Cable News Network pulled the plug on unchallenged commentaries, including the wry observations of Linda Ellerbee, in an unexplained "management decision," CNN spokesmen said Thursday.

Commentaries on CNN's discussion programs, and the opposing views expressed on them, will continue on the 24-hour schedule. Those programs are "Crossfire," "Evans & Novak" and the "Capitol Gang."

CNN gave no reason for the end Monday to free-standing commentaries, including those of Ellerbee, Robert Novak, Marty Schramm,

weatherman Flip Spiceland and sports caster Jim Huber.

Steve Haworth, a spokesman at CNN headquarters in Atlanta, said "it was just a management decision."

All of the commentators but Ellerbee do other work for CNN.

"We hope to keep her on the air in some capacity," said CNN spokesman John Bianchi in New York.

A recent editorial in The Morning News Tribune in Tacoma, Wash., criticized a Spiceland commentary in which the weatherman said women's logic "is one of those contradictory terms like military intelligence."

Haworth would not comment on reports that Ted Turner, who owns

CNN parent Turner Broadcasting System, ordered the end of unchallenged commentaries after the editorial.

Of the major network evening newscasts, only the "NBC Nightly News" still regularly airs commentary, by John Chancellor, ABC's "World News Tonight" does it on an irregular basis with George Will, said Elise Adde, an ABC News spokeswoman.

CBS, whose "CBS Evening News" commentaries in recent years were by Bill Moyers, discontinued them after Moyers quit in 1986 and returned to public TV. CBS, however, still has the only network, humorous commentator working in prime time television — Andy Rooney of "60 Minutes."

# Norville denies violation in appearance

NEW YORK — News anchor Deborah Norville said Tuesday she didn't think she violated NBC News guidelines by doing non-broadcast "interviews" of Philip Morris executives during a paid speaking engagement last February.

NBC News President Michael Gartner, saying that "none of us understood the format (of her engagement) until it was too late," said that in retrospect, NBC would

not have let her appear at the Philip Morris conference.

"Had we understood what was involved or expected of Deborah, we would not have done it. And clearly it's something we wouldn't do again," he said in a prepared response to a query about the paid appearance she cited.

Norville, who since Sept. 5 has been news anchor of the troubled "Today" show, was anchor of "NBC News at Sunrise" when she got an invitation to appear at a Philip

Morris corporate sales presentation in Hawaii.

She said she was given permission to accept by Gerry Solomon, then executive producer of the "Sunrise" program.

"My understanding was that I would be interviewing some marketing people, which I did do," said Norville, whose activities at the conference were first reported in this week's Newsweek magazine.

She said the interviews weren't done for NBC, but simply were part of the conference.

# McCarver notwithstanding, ABC should cover World Series better

So far, the action in the World Series has not measured up to the recent writings about baseball and the Series, perhaps best personified by the pieces of eloquence by A. Bartlett Giamatti with which ABC is opening its Series telecasts.

The Oakland Athletics' dominance and relative quietude of the San Francisco Giants' attack has put

a heavier burden on ABC's production people and announcers to squeeze some interest out of the games for the masses who turn on the tube with an "entertain me" expectation.

It seemed in the first game that Al Michaels, Tim McCarver and Jim Palmer were trying too hard. They got bogged down in verbiage that seemed strained. Worse, they became entangled in "can you top this" dialogue.

Michaels got off a good line when he commented that Jose Canseco's monster home run in Toronto "cleared customs."

That was good enough, but McCarver did not let it lie. He hit it over the head by quoting a line from Bob Uecker in the movie "Major League" that the ball was hit so far "you needed a visa to get it."

Few picked up on McCarver's strongest comment. He said that Rickey Henderson intimidates umpires by his questioning of balls and strikes. That is the kind of comment that could get the Oakland fans down on him — particularly if the A's start losing — but it is also McCarver at his best, taking a stand. He was similarly keen and tough

when he roasted showboating Dave Parker for going into his home run trot on a drive in the second game that did not clear the fence. When Parker just beat the throw from the outfield to make a double out of it, McCarver pointed out that Parker's "styling" had almost cost the A's an out. He was voicing the thoughts of many of us who resent some of the

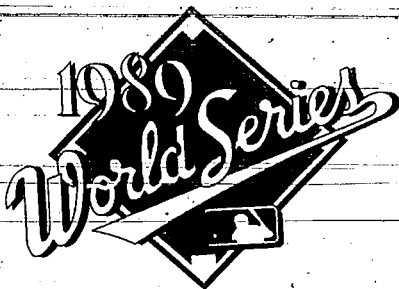

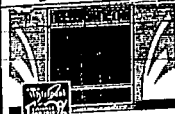

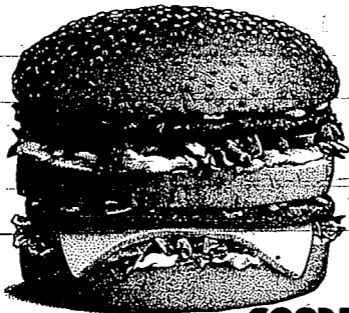
