Global food security—by conventional measures—in stronger than it has been for centuries: Cereals have become progressive. by cheaper during the past 200 years. And despite a world population that has more than doubled since 1950, world supplies of grain per capita are up by a quarter.

Why then does Lester Brown of the Worldwarch Institute talk of impending widespread famine? Why does the National Academy of Sciences urge a fundamental reassessment of American faming practices?

Why are world grain reserves just half the levels of three years ago? And why do at least half a billion people not get enough to

In our complex and interconnected world food system, 'solving' one problem often creates others of equal difficulty and impor-tance. At a time when leadership is urgently needed, the United States is failing to pro-yide it, and indeed is making the problem much worse with its own agricultural poli-

les.

Government interventions, especially those that require tax revenues, have increasingly been judged too intrusive as well as too stuggish to respond to new problems, or simply, misdirected or self-serving.

Three basic public concerns have surfaced, however, with respect to the global agricultural economy, and especially the role of the Upited States in it the sustainability of current agricultural practices, the risks to public health from the chemical residues placed in the food chain by inten-

rowth hormones, and the increased rability of global agriculture to climatic changes.

This country normally exports more than 100 million tons of grain each year, provid-

This country normally exports more than 100 million tons of grant each year, providing roughly half of the import needs of the rest of the world. To provide for both domestic, and foreign customers, however, U.S. farmers use their farmland, fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides and irrigation water very intensively.

Although this moderm, input-intensive agriculture is viewed by much of the Third World as a productive miracle to be imitated, a recent report by the Stantonal Research Council of the National Academy of Sciences, "Alternative Agriculture," argues that serious problems of sustainability and public health are buried in our productivity record.

record.

Worse, the report argues; U.S. farm policy is itself to blame for much of the problem because farmers are encouraged to use more fertilizers, pesticides and irrigation than can be justified by market forces. In effect, our farm policy is subsidizing unsustainable agricultural practices. Farmers often even face economic penalties — the loss of government subsidies—for adopting beneficial practices such as crop rotations.

argue that fundamental shifts in lifestyles are needed now, optimists argue that recenology has solved problems of scarcity in the past and will do so in the future. The pressimists have been wrong every time so far, but clearly the magnitude of the current challenges exceeds anything to date.

The real question is not whether, the pessimists or the optimists are right but whether societies in rich nations and poor have the malytical resources and the political courage to establish a process for addressing the problems.

No matter how pervasive the current belief in the power of the market to allocate resources efficiently, these problems of global agriculture and the environment do not have automatic market fixes. And yet, no matter how committed we may be to government regulation as a safeguard to the nation's public health, only a viable private sector can feed the world.

The United States has a peculiar inability to find an appropriate belance between the public and private sectors. This unresolved tension will serve us poorly as the problems our society faces become increasingly global and intercommected. "Muddling through" with short-nin attacks on problems will not be good enough. We need presidential leadership to provide a longrange vision of the nature of the problems and the solutions.



The judge had upheld a magistrate's order dismissing a request that the warden at the ladaho State Penitentiary be forced to act on Werlinger's appeal of several disciplinary offense reports filed against him.

The prison's grievanch review procedures require action-on such appeals within 21 days. Werlinger filed his habeas corpus petition in magistrate court when the warden had not acted after six weeks, alleging that he was being deprived of his constitutionally protected "liberty interest" in due process of law.

But the Court of Appeals said that even though the prison's grievance even though the prison's grewater review procedure requires action within 21 days, "It does not establish or recognize an underlying substantive right. It simply channels the warden's exercise of discretion in reviewing immate appeals.

"Moreover, it, does, not, provide a substantive consequence." Such as

"Moreover, it does not provide a substantive consequence," such as amelioration of discipline, if the wardern's review is not completed within the specified time."

However, Judge Donald Burnett wrote for the Appeals Court that even though Werlinger, had not been denied a constitutional right, prison officials do not have unlimited discretion in implementing grievance review procedures.


