CHICAGO (AP) — Two distant cousins of the AIDS virus that usually are carried by drug users are also fairly common among female prostitutes, say researchers who interviewed and tested more than 1,300 prostitutes.

The study released Toursday, done by researchers at the federal Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta, expands the groups considered at risk for the viruses and further underscores the importance of public-health efforts to prevent their spread, said Irvin Chen, an outside expert who also has done research on the viruses. The viruses, called HTLV-I and HTLV-II, are transmitted much like the AIDS virus: through shared hypodermic needles, sexual intercourse and from infected mothers to their babies.
