Magic Valley group seeks road money

BOISE - Magic Valley lawmakers, businessmen and city officials paid a call on the Idaho Transportation Board Thursday seeking money for the deteriorating Singing Bridge and other critical, though crumbling, roads.

They received promises - but no guarantees. "We're hurting," said J. Kent Just, executive vice president for the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce. "We're dead-serious, we need some help."

Just spoke on behalf of a Twin Falls delegation that came to Boise to ask the Transportation Board to move the Singing Bridge higher on the state's repair priority list. But the auditorium was also filled with Magic Valley representatives who all agreed that it's time the bridge, Buhl's Clear Lake Grade and the Wendell-Hagerman highway receive attention.

They came armed with photographs, maps, pre-printed speeches and - perhaps the most important weapon of all - a single sheet of paper listing federally aided state funding projects from 1975 to 1988.

The paper shows northern Idaho has taken home the lion's share of the money, \$257.1 million, 24.5 percent of the total budget. The Magic Valley received \$106.2 million, 10.1 percent of the total funds available.

"For a while there it looked like the roads in Magic Valley were better off than other roads in other areas of the state," explained Keith Green, state highway administrator.

That's not the case anymore. On Jan. 8 state officials reduced road restrictions on the Singing Bridge so that not even the city's

new \$400,000 fire truck can cross.

In addition to the obvious safety problems, city and business representatives argued that the weak bridge will have a disastrous effect on the local business community and road systems.

"All of us would like to see the state grow and prosper," said that.

Michael Johnston, director of operations at Universal Frozen Foods in Twin Falls.

"We want to provide jobs so that expansion can happen," Johnston told the board.

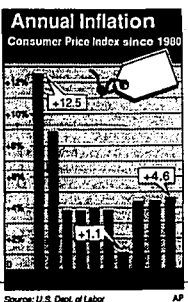
But the problem that we in Twin Falls now face with the Singing Bridge could change all that.

The bridge is currently slated for repair in 1993. It has been listed for repair before and then delayed.

Johnston estimates his company will spend an additional \$3 million each year to comply with weight restrictions until the bridge is fixed. "The plant that I manage is now in the final stages of a \$25 million

expansion. We have hired an additional 300 people in order to man the new production line," Johnston said. "I personally lobbied our corporate staff in Milwaukee, Wis., to allow us to put this expansion in Twin Falls, Idaho, instead of Minnesota where it was originally

Consumer prices hit 8-year high

WASHINGTON - Inflation increased modestly in 1989 to an eight-year high of 4.6 percent, boosted by double-digit price increases for dairy foods, eggs, tobacco and fuel oil, the government said Thursday.

Construction of new housing, meanwhile, plunged 7.6 percent last year to 1.7 million units, the lowest level since the recession year of 1982.

In December, consumer prices climbed a moderate 0.4 percent despite a sharp rise in fuel oil costs during the holiday fuel-oil snap. The weather also prompted a seasonally adjusted 3 percent decline in housing starts - from November to December, the steepest in 10 months.

Economists attributed both the relative stability of consumer price increases and a weak housing industry to a Federal Reserve Board's tight money policy.

Although the central bank has eased its grip on credit in recent months, the Bush administration quickly blasted a suggestion from Federal Reserve policy-makers that interest rates will not fall again anytime soon.

The administration is counting on strong economic growth to bolster tax revenues and help it meet budget deficit targets.

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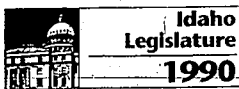
Bridge, grade projects competing for scarce funds

BOISE - Twin Falls County finds itself in an unfortunate position of needing two major road projects at the same time lawmakers are pushing a study that shows Idaho's highway systems need \$7.3 billion in repairs before 1994.

Engineers estimate it will cost \$3 million to repair Buhl's Clear Lake Grade - a project that Magic Valley legislators have tried to fund for the past five years.

And now there's Twin Falls' Singing Bridge with reduced load restrictions and a \$3.5 million price tag for repairs.

Although the Singing Bridge has the advantage by being on the state highway system and the Clear Lake Grade is not, both are competing for a dearth of federal and state highway funds.

"My number one priority is the grade," Rep. Ron Black, R-Twin Falls, said. "We've been working on it longer and I'm a little bit ticked about the Singing Bridge. Somebody should

have seen it coming."

Black started the session with a plan to direct \$15 million of Idaho's \$125 million budget surplus toward economic development projects throughout the state, including the Clear Lake Grade.

Lawmakers told Black they liked the concept but not the specifics. The state Constitution prohibits the Legislature from spending general revenues - such as budget surplus - on specific highway or bridge projects.

The bill is dead and now Black, along with other Magic Valley legislators, is trying to figure out how best to tackle the problem again.

"We're still hoping to get something out of the surplus this session," Black said. "The

need is there and somehow we've got to pay for it."

That's not to say local lawmakers won't be working for the Singing Bridge as well. But the cost of repairing or replacing the circa 1920-bridge will wipe out the state's entire bridge repair budget.

Only 21 bridges are scheduled for replacement in the next six years. The Department of Transportation says 362 bridges need repair.

"We are not keeping up at all," Phil Batt, a member of the state's Transportation Board, told the Senate Transportation Committee Thursday.

Idaho is one of the few states that doesn't

Jury acquits pair of molestation charges

LOS ANGELES - Preschool operators Raymond Buckley and his mother were acquitted Thursday of 52 child molestation charges in the nation's longest and costliest criminal trial, inciting outrage among parents of youngsters in the case.

Jurors deadlocked on 12 sex abuse counts against Buckley and a single conspiracy count against him and his 63-year-old mother, Peggy McMurtin Buckley. Superior Court Judge William Pounders declared a mistrial on those counts and dismissed the deadlocked conspiracy charge against Mrs. Buckley. He set a Jan. 31 hearing to determine whether the 13 unresolved counts will be dismissed against Buckley.

Announcement of the innocent verdicts brought gasps and sobs in the packed courtroom. Buckley, 31, who spent nearly five years in jail because of the charges, and his mother, who was jailed for almost two years, cried as the verdicts

were read. "I've gone through hell and now we've lost everything," Mrs. Buckley said outside court. "My concern was for my son and what they've done to him ... because my son would never harm a child."

"I feel wonderful," said Charles Buckley, father of Raymond and husband of Mrs. Buckley. Raymond Buckley avoided reporters and slipped out the courthouse with his lawyer.

About an hour after the verdicts were announced,

parent Jackie McGauley said, "I'm still in shock. When I first heard it, I didn't believe it. I thought someone had made a mistake."

Parent Mary Mae Clifton added: "I am really disappointed. The anger is beginning to rise. We have programs all over the country that tell chil-

dren to run and tell when somebody hurts them, and our children don't do that and they get a 'not guilty.'"

It shows that our justice system needs a revamp for kids.

"I know my children were molested. I had my daughter sleep between my husband and I for a whole year because she was so afraid somebody would come and get her, that they would kill her, because she told," she said.

The investigation of alleged mass molestation at the suburban McMurtin Pre-School ignited a nationwide wave of worry about child abuse when it came to light in 1983. It produced widespread fear among working parents that their children might be at risk at school.

FBI arrests Barry on drug charges

WASHINGTON - Mayor Marion Barry was arrested by the FBI on a drug charge Thursday night at a downtown hotel in what federal authorities described as "an ongoing public corruption probe."

The U.S. attorney's office said Barry would appear before a federal magistrate on unspecified drug charges shortly after 6 a.m. MST, today. The office did not say where Barry was being held. Details were sketchy, but the manager of the Vista International Hotel, Rex Rice, said Barry had been arrested there.

The embattled mayor, who has been fending off accusations of drug use for at least the last half of his 11 years in office, planned to announce his bid for re-election to a fourth term on Sunday. Jesse Jackson, who recently moved to Washington from Chicago and furiously speculated that he would seek the job, has said he would not run against Barry.

The Vista is an expensive hotel about six blocks from the White House. Two city police officers barred access to upper floors of the hotel to all but guests. A dozen or so teen-agers mixed with reporters, discussing the arrest, outside the hotel.

A city official who asked not to be identified said Barry had no events on his schedule at the hotel Thursday night.

First word of the arrest was broadcast shortly after 8 p.m. MST by television station WRC, which said the mayor attempted to buy cocaine on the seventh floor.

The mayor was led away by undercover police officers and FBI agents, the station said, and his driver and bodyguard were led away separately. There was no announcement of any other arrests.

WRC said Barry was taken to the FBI's national headquarters, where a urine test for drugs was administered. The 53-year-old Barry is a former civil rights worker with graduate training in civility.

Barry, mayor for 11 years, was arrested as a result of an undercover operation conducted jointly by the city police department's internal affairs division and the FBI, according to a statement by U.S. Attorney Jay Stephens and Thomas Duffwald, special agent-in-charge of the FBI's Washington office.

A long-time friend of the mayor's, Charles Lewis, said in open court last fall that he had provided cocaine to the mayor.

Barry was visiting Lewis' hotel in December 1988 when city police were en route to investigate a report that Lewis was offering drugs for sale. When the officers found out Barry was present, they abandoned their mission in an episode not yet fully explained.

GOP rejects Ayre's anti-abortion resolution

WASHINGTON - The Republican Party's internal debate over abortion boiled into the open Thursday, with a party committee refusing to consider an Idahoan's resolution affirming the GOP's fervent anti-abortion stance.

The action came on the opening day of the Republican National Committee's winter meeting, a session dominated by public and private discussions about whether the party should moderate its official stand on abortion as 1990 elections approach.

The session also included a complaint from the leader of a black GOP group, who said despite minority outreach commitments from party chief

Lee Atwater some state chapters "overlook" black.

Fred Brown, head of the National Black Republican Committee, also said that while he has been unable to organize a presidential dinner as an organization fund-raiser, Jesse Jackson and other prominent black Democrats "constantly meet with the president."

But abortion overshadowed other topics as the RNC convened in a hotel blocks from the White House.

One RNC member, Idaho state GOP Chairman Randy Ayre, sought to offer a resolution endorsing the party's 1988 platform recognition of the "sanctity of life."

Ayre was told that his request would not be

considered because he had not submitted a formal resolution in advance of the gathering and that perhaps the issue would be discussed at the next RNC meeting in June.

"But we have elections coming up," he said, "so no avail, during a meeting of the RNC's resolutions committee."

Ayre said after the session, taking a stance similar to that of Atwater, that he personally opposed abortion and believes the party should, too, but that the GOP should not use a candidate's position on abortion as a litmus test for party support.

Still, he said: "I just feel that we should reaffirm the party's longstanding position on the issue."

**Panel chair wants weapons curtailed**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The chairman of House Armed Services Committee called on the Bush administration Thursday to delay production of some high-tech weapons in light of budget pressures and a lessening Soviet threat.

"What we ought to do is pursue a well-researched and developed system, rather than a develop and buy system," Rep. Les Aspin, D-Wis., said in a speech delivered to the National Strategy Forum in Chicago.

A text of the address to the private group interested in national security issues was released in Washington.

The Wisconsin Democrat said the Warsaw Pact can no longer be ordered as a cohesive military alliance ready to respond blindly to ploys from Moscow. In response to areas where the threat has diminished, the United States should reduce its spending on defense.

**Officials OK'd automatic pistols**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The administration studied imported semiautomatic assault-style pistols when it banned imports of the rifle versions last summer but decided to let handgun imports continue, a federal firearms official said Thursday.

"We looked at them in line with the law and we approved the guns," said Jack Killorin, spokesman for the Treasury Department's Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.

Handgun Control Inc. on Wednesday filed a petition with ATF asking the government to impose regulations that would bar from import such semiautomatic assault-style pistols as the Uzi and the Heckler & Koch SP-89.

"Although ATF already has reviewed the pistols, Killorin said the agency would 'examine' the issues that the petition raised." He said he could not predict when the study would be completed.

**Noriega once mistreated prisoners**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Early in his career, Manuel Antonio Noriega was relieved of his duties for mistreating prisoners and was restricted to quarters for drunk and disorderly conduct, according to Defense Intelligence Agency documents.

Noriega, who is jailed in Miami under a federal indictment for drug trafficking, was ousted as Panama's dictator in a U.S. invasion last month.

The documents show that Noriega, who entered the Panama National Guard as an enlisted man on May 26, 1962, had his first run-in less than a year later as a 2nd lieutenant.

**Iowa commander may write book**

NORFOLK, Va. (AP) — The commander of the USS Iowa has decided to retire from the Navy and possibly may write about the turret explosion last April that killed 47 sailors aboard the battleship.

"Down the road, I might have a lot to say. But I've decided to save all that," Capt. Fred P. Moosally said Wednesday.

A Navy investigation into the explosion concluded the blast probably was caused by sabotage by a disgruntled gunner's mate who died in the explosion. That conclusion has been challenged by some of the victims' families and members of Congress.

Moosally, 45, may be the final captain of the Iowa. The Navy said Wednesday that the Iowa, now at the Norfolk Naval Shipyard for repairs to the turret and other maintenance work, will be mothballed afterward to save money.

**FAA wants air threats kept silent**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Aviation Administration is appealing to the nation's airlines not to go public when they receive terrorist threats against passenger flights, an FAA spokesman said Thursday.

The agency plans to make its case during a meeting today with industry representatives in the hope a consensus will emerge.

The FAA called the meeting in the aftermath of the decision by Delta and Northwest airlines to publicize recent threats against some of their flights. The disclosures ran counter to traditional policy in the airline industry to take threats seriously but not to publicize them.

**First lady against women in combat**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Barbara Bush said Thursday that women are not "physically strong enough" for military combat and their presence on battlefields would cause morale problems as well.

She said, in an interview with Mutual Broadcasting, that "I was not clear" in less negative comments on the subject two days earlier.

In an interview with news service reporters on Tuesday, she had given "a qualified yes" to the idea of women in combat.

In the new remarks, she said, "What I said was I don't think women are physically strong enough. But it's much more complicated than that. There's a morale problem, other problems."

**White House backs interest cuts**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The White House broke with its usual practice of not commenting on Federal Reserve policy Thursday by suggesting that cuts in interest rates "are justified" by current economic conditions.

Presidential press secretary Marlin Fitzwater said the Jan. 8 reduction in the prime rate by banks, to 10 percent from 10.5 percent, "hasn't been totally passed through" and that the administration hoped it would be. Although it has engaged in more subtle forms of credit easing, the Fed has not changed its bellwether discount rate — the rate for short-term loans it charges to banks and other financial institutions — for nearly a year.

**Bush calls tax cut proposal a 'charade'**

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush, trying to prevent a political stalling tactic, Tuesday proposed a proposed cut in Social Security taxes was a charade, that would force either an increase in other taxes or a reduction in retirement benefits.

"And I am not going to do it to the older people in this country," Bush said in his first public comment on the proposal by Sen. Daniel Patrick Moynihan, D-N.Y., to roll back the Social Security payroll tax increase that began July 1.

Vice President Dan Quayle took a similar stance.

"I think it's a political trap and once people understand it, they won't fall for it," Quayle said.

On the heels of Moynihan's measure, Sen. Ernest F. Hollings, D-S.C., has proposed a 5 percent value-added tax — a national sales levy — to replace revenues lost both by the Social Security tax cut and Bush's own proposal to lower the tax on capital gains.

Hollings' plan would raise \$53 billion in 1991.

Quayle called Moynihan's plan "a subterfuge for a general tax increase" and pounced on Hollings' proposal as evidence of that.

"The cat's a little bit out of the bag right now," the vice president said in an interview with The Associated Press.

The White House has been put on the spot by Moynihan's plan because it has won support across the political spectrum, even from traditional allies of the president such as the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and conservative groups.

Moreover, it has exposed Bush to criticism that he is exposing a tax cut for the rich with a cut in capital gains taxes, while spurning a break for middle- and low-income Americans with a reduction in Social Security taxes.

"This is an effort to get me to try to raise taxes on the American people by the charade of cutting them, or cut benefits," Bush said.

White House press secretary Marlin Fitzwater, jumping the Moynihan and Hollings proposals together, said: "First we had the tax cut, and now we have the tax increase. Can cuts in benefits be far behind?"

**AIDS pneumonia patients living longer, study says**

People with the most common AIDS-related infection — pneumonia — are living longer now than those infected just a few years ago, according to two studies in Thursday's Journal of the American Medical Association.

The studies: one national, the other in San Francisco, came to similar conclusions, attributing better diagnosis and treatment, as well as the introduction of the drug AZT in 1986, to longer survival rates.

AZT has been shown to slow the progression of HIV infection when given to patients with early AIDS-related complex.

"The studies confirm what physicians and patients have suspected for the past three years," said Dr. Richard E. Chaisson, professor at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine in Baltimore.

"That is, people with AIDS are surviving longer and enjoying a better quality of life than earlier in the epidemic."

The national study looked at 36,847 adults diagnosed with AIDS, using figures compiled by the Centers for Disease Control from local health departments.

The number of people who survived for a one-year period after developing pneumocystis carinii pneumonia, increased significantly.

"Pneumocystis carinii is the major cause of death in people with AIDS."

The survival rate increased from 42.7 percent in 1984 and 1985 to 54.5 percent in 1986 and 1987, the last year for which figures were analyzed.

The second study, considered the more accurate, followed 4,323 cases in San Francisco.

It found that, in 1982, only 10.3 percent of AIDS patients with pneumonia lived a year.

In 1987, the figure rose to 17.9 percent.

Preliminary data from 1988 and 1989 indicate that people with AIDS will continue to live longer, said

George Lemp, author of the San Francisco study and a doctor at that city's Department of Public Health AIDS office.

The average survival rate is now 18 months, but "as more and more treatments become available, we expect the survival rate to lengthen up to two years," Lemp said.

Some of those in the San Francisco study are in their ninth year since diagnosis.

Of 112,241 AIDS cases reported to the Centers for Disease Control between 1981 and Oct. 31, 1989, 59 percent are known to have died.

"At this point, we don't know how far out we can stretch survival and whether there will actually be treatments that will make this a chronic infection," Lemp said.

"That's a hope right now."

**AT&T announces discount**

WASHINGTON (AP) — AT&T said Thursday it wants to offer Valentine's Day long-distance discounts to make up for millions of customers who were unable to use the company's network earlier this week.

American Telephone & Telegraph Co. asked the Federal Communications Commission for approval to charge holiday rates on Feb. 14 to its residential, business and international customers.

"We are making this gesture to our relationship with our customers, knowing there is no way to make up for the inconvenience," AT&T Chairman Robert E. Allen said.

**King's son wants no substitutes**

BOISE (AP) — A suggested "Human Rights Day" is no substitute for Martin Luther King Day, the slain-civil-rights leader's oldest son told a Boise crowd Wednesday night.

"That, to some degree, is insensitive," Martin Luther King III told hundreds of people who packed the ballroom in Boise. State University's Student Union building.

Earlier at a news conference, King said a Human Rights Day is "almost like humanitarian love... You love everything in general and nothing in particular."

But a Human Rights Day is needed, the 32-year-old King said. However, no one would suggest a generic version of the federal holiday honoring George Washington, the first president of the United States, he said.

Idaho is one of only four states that do not honor the civil-rights leader with a state holiday.

During his address, King said his father provided a model for the nation. "He didn't just talk about action. He lived his message. Because Martin Luther King Jr. came our way, because Rosa Parks sat down on a bus in 1955... we've made some great strides."

**Morgan hiring outrages Hispanics**

POCATELLO, Idaho (AP) — The son of former state Democratic Party chairman Tom Morgan was hired for a state job requiring fluency in Spanish, even though he was not fluent in the language, Gov. Cecil Andrus has confirmed.

The Idaho Department of Employment hired Richard "Rick" Morgan as a Job Service consultant in the agency's Pocatello office. Andrus said Thursday during a radio talk show appearance.

Mr. Morgan, a former Pocatello jeweler, was chairman of the Idaho Democratic Party from 1983 to 1988.

While the younger Morgan had some background in Spanish, he was not "proficient or fluent," the governor said.

"There are always activities like that in a bureaucracy and then they are ferreted out," he said. "But very clearly, the Spanish-speaking people in this community are entitled to someone fluent."

**Legislature wants agency control**

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Legislature once again is seeking authority to reject or change agency regulations without subjecting the action to a governor's veto.

The lawmakers have tried before — most recently last session when the House approved a proposed constitutional amendment, but the Senate, with Democrats leading the opposition, did not.

The House State Affairs Committee on Thursday voted introduction of the latest effort over the opposition of Democrats. The resolution would ask voters in the November general election to amend the Idaho Constitution on the agency rule question.

At dispute is whether the Legislature can reject agency rules and regulations, adopted to carry out laws, by concurrent resolution not subject to veto by the governor. The alternative is by statute, with the legislation going through review and possible veto by the governor.

**Pastor heads new pro-choice lobby**

BOISE (AP) — A new group led by a Boise pastor says it plans to lobby the Idaho Legislature against any proposed measures to restrict the availability of abortions.

Rev. James Hulett of the United Methodist Church announced the formation of Freedom Means Choice at a Statehouse news conference Thursday.

The pastor said "he is" on a six-member, nonpartisan, nondenominational statewide steering committee representing "a broad spectrum of the state."

**Winchester wants new uranium tests**

LEWISTON (AP) — Winchester city officials have asked the Idaho Division of Environment to test a third time for uranium levels in one of the city's two municipal water wells.

Tests last spring and later in the fall showed a level of 33 pica curies, which is considered borderline for concern, according to George Dekan of the state's water quality control office at Lewiston.

Brenda McCann, a member of the Winchester City Council who serves as water and sewer commissioner, said Wednesday city officials will discuss the situation at its regular meeting Feb. 5.

**Bannock County latest Gem winner**

BOISE (AP) — Bannock County is Idaho's latest Gem Community, honored for its economic development efforts.

"Bannock County has placed itself among the leaders in Idaho in building an effective, professional economic development program," said Gov. Cecil Andrus on Thursday, announcing the award.

**Kempthorne won't seek seat in Congress**

BOISE (AP) — Boise Mayor Dirk Kempthorne says he will not run for Congress this year but might take a shot at the Republican governor nomination in four years.

"I do not intend to seek any political office in 1990," Kempthorne told a Boise news conference Thursday afternoon. "At this time, the right place for me is right here. I will remain as mayor of Boise."

Kempthorne was elected on a nonpartisan basis to a second four-year term as Boise mayor two months ago. He had been considering a possible bid for the Republican nomination to take on Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus, or running for the 1st District congressional seat being vacated by Rep. Larry Craig in his campaign for the U.S. Senate position now held by James McClure.

Kempthorne said he decided this week not to run after talking to a number of people and his family. "Ultimately, that responsibility to continue the work we've started here in Boise," he said.

He acknowledged that 1990 would be a good time to run for Congress, because there is no incumbent to beat for the 1st District seat. But he said there will be other chances.

"Yes, 1990 is a window of opportunity, but it's not the only window," he said.

He said he received more encouragement to run for governor this year than for Congress, and that he would "seriously consider" running for governor in 1994.

He said that wasn't because

Andrus has indicated he probably will not run for another term in 1994.

These circumstances are very challenging about taking on an incumbent. Nobody's unbeatable," Kempthorne said. "In fact, if he (Andrus) were to run again in '94, that might be even more enticing."

Kempthorne said he will maintain a busy schedule of speaking engagements and other trips outside Boise in the coming years to expand his name-recognition base.

As Kempthorne declared himself out of the GOP 1st District congressional race, state Sen. Skip Smyser, R-Parma, nearly declared himself in. Smyser plans to announce his campaign in a series of appearances starting early today.

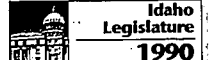
**Crapo says abortion debate plan neutral**

BOISE (AP) — Senate President Pro Tem Michael Crapo has acknowledged that the plan for managing the looming abortion debate should minimize chances for severe political bloodletting. But he still adamantly rejects Democratic claims that the scheme was politically motivated.

"Some members of the Democratic Caucus wanted the Senate to be the battleground," the Idaho Falls Republican said Thursday. "With the procedure we've adopted, I think we are going to significantly eliminate a lot of the battles."

Some Democrats have objected to the plan that would require all abortion bills to be introduced in the House on grounds that such a move would lead to the harshest positions on each side of the emotional question before it hits the Senate and its slim Republican majority.

Needing to pick up just three seats in the November election to take control of the Senate for the first time in three decades, those Democrats maintain the procedure was intended to shield potentially vulnerable Senate Republicans from having to take a stand on the most extreme proposals expected to



surface in the coming weeks.

"The procedural ban" on introduction of abortion bills in the Senate was expected to be challenged by Democrats in the next several days.

The Senate deadline for individual members to introduce legislation is the end of the week.

Crapo declined to say whether eliminating many of the potential abortion battles would be politically advantageous to Republicans. He said only that it would serve to reduce the level of conflict on a highly emotional issue that could overwhelm the election-year session if not properly managed.

"I guess whenever an issue like this comes up, people ask you are playing politics or being a statesman," Crapo said. "I don't think we need to apologize at all. We had a battle last week, and we fought it. We didn't contrive it. I think we are right."

Under the plan, all-abortion bills must be submitted to the House State Affairs Committee by Feb. 12.

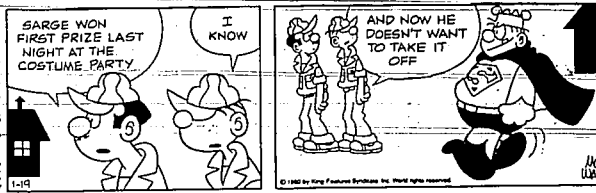

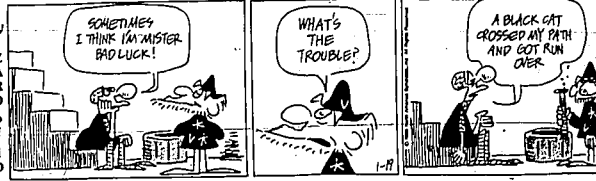

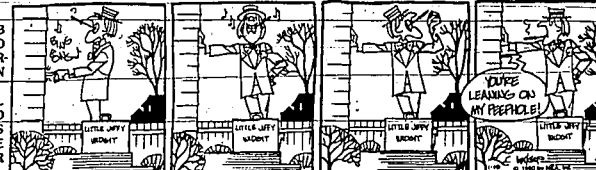

## Soviet Moslems cross Iran border

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — Hundreds of Soviet Moslems crossed the border Thursday between Iran and the troubled Soviet republic of Azerbaijan, Iranian reporters said.

The official Islamic Republic News Agency said 430 Soviet Azerbaijanis returned from visits to Iran after scores of their Iranian relatives staged a four-hour farewell ceremony. IRNA also said dozens of Azerbaijanis crossed into Iran.

It was the largest reported number of Azerbaijanis to cross the border in one day since protests and ethnic violence broke out along the frontier this month.

## Chinese free democracy protesters

BEIJING (AP) — China has released 573 people arrested for their part in pro-democracy protests last spring and held for six months or more without being formally charged, it was reported Thursday.

The "lawbreakers" were released after they pleaded guilty and showed repentance," the official Xinhua News Agency quoted a Public Security Ministry official as saying.

The report did not provide the names of any of the released and Chinese sources familiar with those being let go say it does not appear that any leading student activists from the April-June democracy movement are among the freed.

## Some nations continue ivory trade

GENEVA (AP) — An international treaty to protect the dwindling herds of African elephants by banning trade in ivory went into force Thursday but leading producing and consuming nations refused to be bound by it.

Five southern African nations that regularly cull their elephant populations have filed for exemption, while China has declared it will continue importing the prized tusks.

## E. Germans arrest former leader

EAST BERLIN (AP) — Authorities on Thursday arrested a former Politburo member under investigation for corruption and abuse of power and put him in prison to await trial, along with seven other ex-leaders.

Communists and opposition groups held their eighth round of talks, with the opposition demanding a role in dismantling the hated secret police force. Negotiators unanimously approved a resolution calling on Premier Hans Modrow to give them periodic updates on disbanding the force.

## Poles want local elections, too

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — Prime Minister Tadeusz Mazowiecki asked parliament Thursday to move up the date for democratic elections for local governments, saying Communist holdouts are resisting reform.

"The government's most important task next to leading the nation out of economic collapse is the building of a strong and stable democratic foundation for a democratic system," Mazowiecki told the Sejm, the lower house of parliament.

## Bulgaria arrests ex-leader Zhivkov

SOFIA, Bulgaria (AP) — Former leader Todor Zhivkov was put under house arrest and charged with abuse of power and fomenting ethnic unrest during his 34-year reign, the government-run news agency BTA reported Thursday.

# Japanese nab man who shot Nagasaki mayor

TOKYO (AP) — Police arrested an avowed right-wing terrorist Thursday in the shooting of Nagasaki's mayor, who had endured a year of death threats after saying Emperor Hirohito bore some responsibility for World War II.

The shooting, said to be the first of an important politician in this country since the war, outraged many Japanese and brought calls to heighten respect for freedom of speech.



Hitoshi Motoshima, 67, was shot in the back Thursday as he left City Hall. He was reported in serious but not life-threatening condition after surgery to repair damage from a single bullet that pierced his left lung.

The gunman escaped alone in a white car, but within five hours police said they had arrested Kazumi Tajiri, 40, of Tokyo, in a Nagasaki hotel. Tajiri admitted to shooting Motoshima and was held on suspicion of attempted murder, said a Nagasaki police spokesman who refused to have his name used.

## Kohl eases German claims to Polish lands

BONN, West Germany (AP) — A day after Kohl assured Poles that Germans do not cover territory lost after World War II, the leader of the Free Democrats who share power with Kohl's party called Thursday for formal recognition of the current Polish borders.

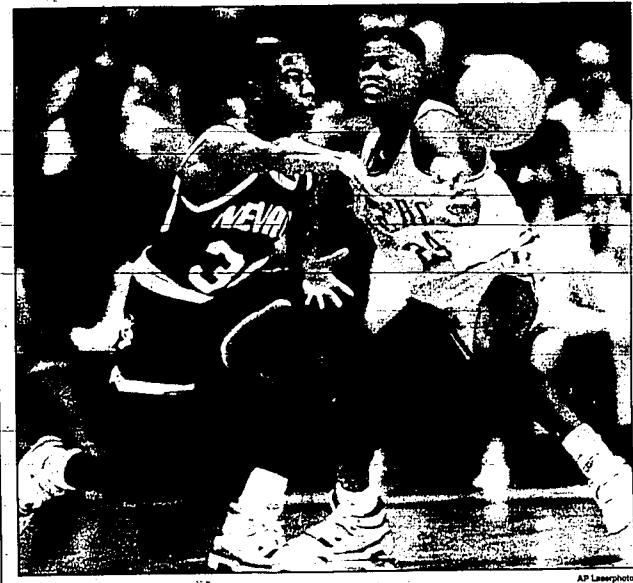

# Ford quits Clemson post in wake of charges

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Clemson's Danny Ford, armed with a \$1 million settlement, resigned Thursday and ended an 11-year coaching tenure that brought the Tigers national prominence and NCAA penalties.

Ford's resignation comes less than two weeks after the NCAA informed Clemson, the top football power in the Atlantic Coast Conference, of 14 alleged rule violations committed between 1984 and 1988 by the football program.

The 41-year-old Ford said he would "cooperate and participate with Clemson" in responding to the NCAA inquiry, which must be completed by March 12.

"I deny any wrongdoing on my part," Ford said Thursday. "And I am confident that an impartial review of the facts will so prove."

In his 11 years as coach, Ford had the third best winning percentage among active coaches, having led the Tigers to a 96-29-4 record, including a 6-2 mark in bowl games, and the 1981 national championship. In agreeing to leave Clemson, where he spent 13 seasons as a head coach and assistant, Ford will receive \$190,000 a year for the next three — and possibly five — years and \$100,000 to pay off the mortgage on his farm.

The school did not immediately name a replacement for Ford, and an athletic department source said it

may be a week before a new head coach is named.

The also said Ford may have been forced to resign, pointing to comments made by one recruit who said Ford told him "the only way he'd get away from Clemson is if they fired him."

Athletic Director Bobby Robinson praised Ford for his accomplishments but said there had been some conflicts between the two men.

"We have honest differences of

opinion on certain basic aspects of the football program," Robinson said. "A separation under any terms would be difficult. An amicable parting is certainly less painful for all involved."

"That is why we felt it was in the university's best interests to agree to a fair settlement under the terms of Ford's contract and bring the matter to a close."

Neither Ford nor Robinson would be available to comment further, a school spokesman said. Attempts to reach Ford at his home were unsuccessful.

Ford's resignation had been rumored since the NCAA outlined the specific rules allegations facing Clemson on Jan. 5. The NCAA has said one Clemson coach gave a player up to \$150 on at least two occasions and told him to distribute the money to "selected" players. At least six coaches also are charged with a variety of recruiting violations.

Clemson officials have refused to say how many of the coaches named in the 15-page NCAA report are still on the staff.

This is not the first time the NCAA has investigated Clemson. In 1982, the program was placed on two years' probation after the NCAA uncovered 79 rule violations that occurred between the 1976 and 1982.

Charley Pell was the Clemson coach until the end of the 1978 season, when Ford took over and coached the Tigers in the 1978 Gator Bowl. Clemson defeated Ohio State 17-15, but the game was overshadowed by an incident involving the late Ohio State coach

Woody Hayes, who was fired after he punched Tigers linebacker Charlie Bauman late in the contest.

Ford's resignation also may have been an attempt by the university to ease any penalties the NCAA may place on the school. Several schools in recent months have had their punishment lightened because the head coach was no longer employed there when the NCAA Committee on Infractions decided on sanctions.

The infractions committee is expected to meet April 20-22 in Kansas City and to announce its decision two to four weeks later.

Ford, who played at Alabama and later served as an assistant, joined the Tigers as an assistant in 1977. Under Ford, Clemson went 12-0 and beat Nebraska 22-15 in the Orange Bowl to win the national title. Clemson finished 10-2 this past season — the third straight 10-2 season for the Tigers.

With the retirement of Bo Schembechler at Michigan after this past season, only Tom Osborne of Nebraska and Joe Paterno of Penn State had better winning percentages than Ford among active coaches.

Under terms of the resignation agreement, Ford will be paid \$190,000 a year for the next three years and up to five years if he doesn't accept another head coaching job before 1992. The university also agreed to pay \$13,000 in interest on Ford's farm and the balance of the mortgage — \$100,000 — by Jan. 2, 1991. Under the agreement, Ford also will receive six Clemson season football tickets for the next three to five years.

# New Olympic coach may be from NBA

DALLAS — Dave Gavitt, the president of USA Basketball, said he believes the selection process for the 1992 Olympic team will be altered and that the coach of that team will come from the NBA.

Gavitt predicts the days of inviting 50 or 60 players to try out for the Olympic team have been rendered obsolete now that professional players have been cleared to compete. Gavitt envisions a streamlined process that will put a stronger team, expected to be almost all professional, on the international court and carve no more than six weeks out of the schedule of the Olympic coach.

Gavitt said a coach could be named as early as May at a meeting of the USAB Basketball Committee. "My gut tells me it's likely that the coach will either be a professional coach or have a professional background," Gavitt said. "I say that not to prejudice the selection process, but I think it makes sense. Many of those who have indicated a desire to play want to play for a pro coach."

Whichever the committee selects, Gavitt said he is convinced the selection process will be changed. —The 192 Summer Olympics run from July 25 to Aug. 9 in Barcelona, Spain. Gavitt said having the coach and team in place by early July of that year should

give everyone enough time to prepare.

That means the concerns of Golden State coach Don Nelson, who said he would be willing to take a one-year sabbatical from the Warriors to coach the Olympic team, are unfounded.

"With the length of the NBA season, you're not going to have eight weeks to prepare, and you don't need it," said Gavitt, the commissioner of the Big East Conference. "I think you can get it done in three weeks then take the team to the Olympics. Given that, I don't see any coach having to take a sabbatical."

Rod Thorn, the NBA's vice president of operations and a member of the USAB Basketball Committee, is another who is convinced the selection process will change.

"In the past, you had a series of trials that took up a huge amount of time," Thorn said. "I think that part of it will be changed. To what degree, I can't tell you. But I do know you will not invite 60 NBA players and let them try out."

"What we're talking about is deciding who wants to be on the team. We still have to get together and work it out, but you're not going to have trials that go on forever. You will pick the team then go to work. I think we can identify who the best players are very quickly."

# Mariners enjoy signing deals with new owner

# Goodwill officials doubt unrest will affect games

SEATTLE (AP) — Goodwill Games officials said Thursday they don't expect ethnic unrest in the Soviet Union and the political changes in Eastern Europe will keep the athletes from competing.

"We feel if anything, the Goodwill Games are becoming more and more important to the Gorbachev administration and to the Soviets in general," said Bob Walsh, president of the Seattle Organizing Committee.

In addition to the problems that are going on over there, the games are the single biggest event, not only in sports, that's scheduled to take place," Walsh said.

"His remarks came at a news conference to announce preparations for the games, which will be held in Seattle and other venues across the state of Washington from July 20 through Aug. 5."

Invitations to compete in the games will be extended to the top American and Soviet athletes and teams and to the six best athletes and

teams in each event. About 2,500 athletes are expected to take part.

There will be competition in most Olympic sports, including swimming, track and field, basketball, cycling and gymnastics.

Walsh, who has been traveling monthly to the Soviet Union making arrangements, said the United States and Soviet governments consider the Goodwill Games a "kind of thread" between the two countries.

"The Soviets are extremely dedicated to the games. They want them to come off well," he said. "He predicted politics wouldn't affect these games."

"We have sent invitations to the athletes from those countries and they have accepted," Walsh said when asked about the turmoil in Eastern Europe.

"I think, if anything, everything that's happening has strengthened the importance of the games," Walsh said. Games officials have been talking to Soviet officials about the unrest in Lithuania, Walsh said.

# Krieg expected to be highest-paid Seahawk

SEATTLE — Now that Steve Largent has settled into retirement, Dave Krieg probably will succeed him as the highest-paid Seattle Seahawk in history.

During almost seven seasons as Seattle's starting quarterback, Krieg has his base salary rise to \$50,000 last year at contract, a three-year contract that could start soon, he will see a substantial increase, almost certain to top the \$1.35 million Largent received in his final season and unquestionably over running back Curt Warner's base salary of \$1.1 million.

But Krieg's agent, Doug Baldwin, said he has not "zerced" him on a number. "It's a matter of finding a comfort zone — for David — and for the Seahawks," Baldwin said. Baldwin intends to open negotiations soon, he said, with Tom Flores, Seahawks president, in

an effort to reach an early agreement.

"I don't see any advantage in waiting," Baldwin said. "I'd like to get it done early. I'll give Tom a call and see when he wants to get the ball rolling."

Krieg, who will be 32 next season, is among 25 Seahawks who will become restricted free agents Feb. 1 when their present contracts expire.

However, Baldwin said he has no thoughts of shopping around to determine what Krieg might command on the open market, partly because there is no open market as such for football's restricted free agents.

National Football League players who become restricted free agents are eligible to sign with other teams. But the present compensation is two first-round draft choices for almost any front-line player. In addition, any offer may be matched by the player's present team.

### Jacklin Seed seeks 30-day hearing delay

JEROME — The Jacklin Seed Co. has asked the Jerome County Planning and Zoning Commission for a 30-day delay in a hearing on the company's proposal to build a seed processing plant.

The hearing was moved from Jan. 29 to Feb. 26, commission administrator Glenn Elwell said. "We didn't have any reason not to," he said. No time has been set for the postponed hearing.

The company says it needs the extra time for a "special effort to correctly and completely provide the net positive environmental information" to Magic Valley citizens.

"We believe it is our farmers' and company's public responsibility to provide full and complete information to the people of the Twin Falls-Jerome area before becoming a fellow citizen and neighbor," a company news release said.

The company doesn't want to invest \$3.5 million if it doesn't have the support of the community, the release said.

### Filer school investment to earn \$1,300 annually

FILER — The school district has a new investment plan that will earn it about \$1,300 more a year.

Superintendent Dave Teater told the board Tuesday the proposal from West One Bank provides for all excess money in the account to automatically flow into an investment account. When money is needed it is automatically withdrawn, he said.

In other matters, Teater announced the selections for January employees of the month, chosen by fellow teachers: Dorothy Bos, Hollister school; Sue Lammers, middle school; Sharon Wells, Filer elementary; and J. Howard Moon, high school.

### Darrington will seek re-election to state Senate

BOISE — Although he said he's had a lot of encouragement to run for Congress-state-Sen. Denton Darrington, R-Declu, has decided to run for re-election to the Idaho Senate.

"My petitions are out," the four-term lawmaker said Wednesday.

Darrington may have put plans for a Washington office on hold, but he said he won't rule out a Republican leadership post. Although he did not get the job, Darrington was named this fall as possible successor to Senate Majority Leader Roger Fairchild, who resigned to run for governor.

### Better Business Bureau has local toll-free number

TWIN FALLS — The Better Business Bureau doesn't have a Twin Falls office yet, but it has installed a toll-free number so area residents won't have to pay to complain.

Ken Thornberg, executive director of the bureau's Treasure Valley office, said the bureau has half the number of member businesses it needs to open a Twin Falls office.

The bureau, on a membership drive since July, has between 50 and 60 member businesses. The Better Business Bureau supports its activities with membership dues from businesses.

But the original goal, having a toll-free number in place by early this year, has been reached, Thornberg said. The number is 1-800-539-8737.

Thornberg said an increasing number of complaints from the Magic Valley area prompted the bureau to consider opening a Twin Falls office.

BOISE — Randy Russell, of Twin Falls, has been reappointed by Gov. Cecil Andrus to the Veterans Affairs Commission. Upon confirmation by the Idaho Senate, Russell will serve on the commission until Jan. 15, 1993.

### Twin Falls city, Jerome County bond beneficiaries

BOISE — The city of Twin Falls and Jerome County received the largest industrial revenue bonds approved by state officials in 1989.

Gov. Cecil Andrus reported Thursday that more than \$31 million in state-arranged financing was approved for construction and equipping manufacturing and processing facilities.

In Twin Falls, an \$8 million bond issue funded improvements at the Norco Window manufacturing facility. In Jerome County, a \$7.8 million bond was issued to finance improvements at Spears Manufacturing Co. plastic pipe manufacturing plant.

Eight bonds were issued statewide to manufacturing plants in Boise, Nampa, Bonner County, Meridian and Kootenai County.

## New school on agenda for Hansen

HANSEN — The School Board will meet at 8 p.m. Monday to look for ways to cut the estimated cost of building a new high school.

The board will look at a \$1.8 million plan for a new school drawn up by the architectural firm of Leatham & Krohn, Boise. But the design is not as closely tied to Hansen's specific needs as it could be and the price tag can likely be cut, Superintendent Richard Smith says.

The board meets Monday in a work session so no decisions can be made, but work sessions are open to the public. The board generally agreed this week to develop a more specific plan to present to the public.

"We need to use good common sense before presenting (a plan) to the public," Trustee Bill Allen said.

Last year, the board began discussing long-range plans for the district's aging high school. A committee of local residents formed to look at the problem considered remodeling the current school or building a new one.

The board has not voted on which option is best, but architects Daryl Leatham and Dick Krohn both recommended building a new school because of the high cost of bringing the existing high school up to codes if it is remodeled and the board authorized it to \$5,000 for the architect's plan.

The plan is a rough sketch of what could be built but was not meant to fit Hansen's specific needs as close as it could.

For example, Smith said, the proposed library is 300 square feet larger than the current library. Also, classrooms could be smaller than the 800-square-foot size in the plan, he said.

The \$1.8 estimate includes the demolition of the existing high school, new high school construction, site development, paving of the parking lot, construction of locker rooms and either a vocational agriculture or industrial arts building.

Smith said the district can cut costs by reducing the total square footage or delaying landscaping plans or paving. "It appears that we could knock off two rooms from the plan and still plan for growth," he told the board.

After tailoring the plan to Hansen's needs, the board will take the information to the citizens' committee, which will work closely with the board to develop a proposal for the public, board Chairman Gene Walker said.

Committee member John Gibson said he believes local residents would favor a new school over remodeling. "The majority of people I've talked to are strong proponents of the new building," he said. "I think the

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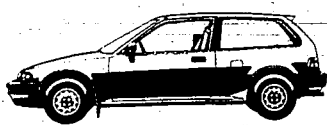
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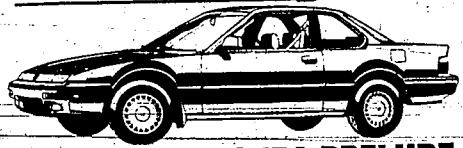


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# 'Steel Magnolias' ends up being cartoonish, unbelievable

In the published version of Robert Harling's play "Steel Magnolias," he opens with this cautionary author's note: "The women in this play are witty, intelligent and, above all, real characters. They in no way, shape or form are meant to be portrayed as cartoons or caricatures."

## Review

In Harling's movie adaptation, directed by Herbert Ross, he must have prefaced his script with the reverse caution. The film's yammering sextet is relentlessly cartoonish. They do so much prancing and sashaying and elbowing that the film, set in small-town Louisiana, turns into Southern-fried vaudeville. The knockabout unbelieveability is exhausting: "You want to run for cover."

M'Lynn (Sally Field) is the well-to-do matron whose pretty-as-a-peach daughter Shelby (Julia Roberts), a severe diabetic, is about to be married. Truvy (Dolly Parton), the owner of her own styling salon, Truvy's Beauty Spot, presides over Shelby's pouffing and perfuming. The Beauty Spot is the town's mission control for gossip, and, in the film's opening minutes, we're introduced to its leading players. Besides

M'Lynn, Shelby and Truvy, there are Clairee (Olympia Dukakis), the preening widow of the town's former mayor, Quiser (Shirley MacLaine), a rich, wildly eccentric

scold; and Annelle (Daryl Hannah), the salon's mousy new "born-again" assistant. In the course of the film, these women are thrown into crises that

call upon their deepest reserves of empathy. And are they ever empathic! They stalk about acting curmudgeonly in order — of course — to hide how deeply they care. They go

in for heavy-duty bonding. Where trouble hits, weeping and wisecracks are sure to follow. When Truvy says "Laughter through tears is my favorite emotion," she's acting as the writer's mouthpiece. Harling's play, his first, has been "opened up" as a movie, and, as a result, his dramatic intentions are clearer than they were on the stage. "Steel Magnolias" is a serio-comic yowl about the sustaining powers of sisterhood. It's also, by implication, a sort of all the male-bonding dramas in our midst. The filmmakers want us to recognize the tensile strength in the filigree of women's lives. These gals may be nurturing but they're also hardrabbable.


By contrast, the wimpification of the men in this movie is fairly amusing to observe. Shelby's husband (Dylan McDermott), her father (Tom Skerritt), Annelle's hubby (Kevin O'Connor), Truvy's mate (Sant Shepard) are all secondary players. They loiter, dazed, on the fringes of the action. Since few films feature as many women as this one does, their prominence here is a form of pay-back. They've seized the screen from the big boys and they won't let go.

Some of the seizing is artful, some isn't. Parton has a sweet, lilting presence, and a suggestion of hard-won disappointment beneath her wigs and wide smiles. Roberts has such fragile freshness that the scene in


which she goes into diabetic shock seems like a violation of nature. Dukakis isn't breaking any new ground with her trademarked faintness, but she gets off a few zingers. (She also seems triumphantly impervious to her sometime Southern accent.) Field is rather bland, though — too fey and noble. And MacLaine is writhed. Her performance is a scenery-gobbling amalgam of her work in films like "Terms of Endearment" and "Madame Sousatzka."

Another of Truvy's sayings is, "There is no such thing as natural beauty," but the entire film stands in opposition to this credo. It is precisely the natural, untrussed beauty of these women that we're meant to recognize. Harling and Ross may be deliberately going for the exaggerated and the overblown. They may be pouffing reality, but only as a heightened contrast to their people's all-too-real sorrows. The trouble is, the pouffing crowds out the pathos. That's not entirely bad. The saps-stick camaraderie at least has some energy, while the paths is shameless, four-hanky stuff.

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# 'Always' a sentimental remake that lasts forever

**ALWAYS (PG).** A better title for Steven Spielberg's remake of the soppy 1943 Spencer Tracy movie "A Guy Named Joe" might be "Forever," which is roughly its running time. All of us who fell under Holly Hunter's spell in "Broadcast News" and stuck to her through "Miss Firecracker" are in for a rough time of it. Cuteness turning overripe is not a pleasant sight. Richard Dreyfuss can do no better than his dialogue or his situation — or his direction, and all of that is, as they say, tooth-rotting.

**BACK TO THE FUTURE, PART II (PG).** If "Back to the Future" made you bored and querulous, then the tumbling inventiveness in its sequel may come as a pleasant surprise. Of course, if you were among the 92 percent of the world who loved the ride in Dr. Emmett

**Brown's diabolical DeLoane** back in 1985, then "Part II" is your oyster. Well, your hamburger with onions. If it proves anything, it's that director Robert Zemeckis is getting cooler and even more adept at controlled mayhem. With Michael J. Fox, Christopher Lloyd, Lea Thompson.

**BLAZE (R).** The raucous and selectively true story of the love affair of Earl K. Long, the 63-year-old governor of Louisiana, and red-haired, 28-year-old burlesque queen Blaze Starr. A New Orleans throw himself into bringing every eccentric, disrespectful quirk of Ol' Earl's to life and he succeeds fiercely well. With her tumbling red hair and her pansy-shaped face, Lolita Davichovich is lascivious and endangering all at once. The one who has pulled back is writer-director Ron Shelton. How the maker-of-Bull-Durham could have come this close and then have tip-toed away from a portrait as wild and as flamboyant as his sub-

jects is a question to ponder.

**INTERNAL AFFAIRS (R).** Two cops on opposite sides of the law — one a corrupt opportunist, one his investigator — get tangled up in another of those doppleganger melodramas where pursuer and pursued become one. Richard Gere as the sexy bad cop, and Andy Garcia as his glowing nemesis are magnetic actors, but the story, weirdly chopped up, simply floats away from them, and director Mike Figgis ("Stormy Monday") doesn't give it enough swanky style to disguise the impotence.

**THE LITTLE MERMAID (G).** Directed and written by John Musker and Ron Clements, with a yeoman team of animators, designers and craftspeople, this impudent, grandiose, multilevel crowd-pleaser shares with the classic Disney animated features of the '30s and '40s a sense of over-reaching, of grabbing every snazzy effect possible within old-line narrative forms. Ariel, the saucy heroine, is a sexy honey-bunch not much like the sad noble

sea-maid in Hans Christian Andersen's original story. But there is a primal power that most recent Disney cartoons lack: Midway through, Sam Wright, who is the voice of a hypersensitive crab named Sebastian, leads a clypeo name called "Under the Sea" — an infectious show-stopper by songwriters Howard Ashman and Alan Menken — and afterwards should have any audience in his pocket.

**TANGO AND CASH (R).** The summit meeting of Russian director Andrei Konchalovsky and Sylvester Stallone produces not cinematic gladiolus, not the same old dumpy, recycled car-chase thriller. Mismatched cops, surrounded by cliches, explosions and wild jailbreaks, dual-impotent drug czars, while continuously and witlessly wise-cracking. Konchalovsky shares direction with Peter MacDonald and Albert Magnoli; Stallone, playing a natty dude, shares star-time with scruffily Kurt Russell. The movie pulverizes them all.

## Viewers flock to see 'Fourth'

**HOLLYWOOD (AP)** — The scaring Vietnam War film "Born on the Fourth of July" was the nation's favorite movie for the second week in a row, while "Glory" and "Driving Miss Daisy" performed strongly in wider release.

"Born on the Fourth of July," starring Tom Cruise in the real-life story of an idealistic patriot whose attitudes about war are changed dramatically by Vietnam, collected \$8 million over the weekend, according to figures released by Entertainment Data Inc.

In second place with \$5.7 million was the black divorce comedy "The War of the Roses," starring Michael Douglas and Kathleen Turner as the bitterly married couple. It was followed in third by the action-adventure movie "Tango & Cash," which made \$3.4 million.

"Internal Affairs," the new police drama starring Richard Gere as a corrupt and sexually obsessed cop, opened well in fourth place, netting \$5 million on 975 screens.

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# Singer Tanya Tucker does motherhood her own special way

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Singer Tanya Tucker, riding out another controversy in her tempestuous career, believes her lifestyle has helped make her intriguing.

"People love to read about people like me," the 31-year-old country music star said in an interview. "They don't like to read about people who never do anything wrong, never say anything wrong, have never been to a wild party."

"People like me sell magazines. The (National) Enquirer makes a fortune off people like me. Who would you read about if it wasn't for people like me?"

In the latest stir in her life, she's the unmarried mother of a daughter born in July. Just 1½ years prior to the birth, Tucker was treated for drug addiction at the Betty Ford Center. In a deposition released last May, she admitted using cocaine with a Miami woman acquaintance charged with murder.

In the years prior to that, Tucker was linked romantically to singers Glen Campbell (23 years her senior), Andy Gibb and Merle Haggard (21 years her senior), actor Don Johnson, boxer Gerry Cooney and several other professional athletes.

Around Nashville's Music Row, she's long been regarded as a vicious dynamo looking for a whirlwind to deposit her at the next party. She said about motherhood: "I've never done anything the normal way. This is just one more example."

About the unidentified father: "It's just one of those things that didn't work out. He's not involved;

he's removed from the whole thing. That's his decision. I'm perfectly fine with that. I'm really pleased to have her all to myself, to be honest."

Her turbulent private life aside, Tucker has been one of steadfast hit-makers during the past four years. In fact, she's an 18-year show business veteran having started at age 13 with the first hit version of the song "Delta Dawn."

Her top records include "I Won't Take Less Than Your Love," "Strong Enough to Bend," "One Love at a Time," "I'll Come Back as Another Woman," "Love Me Like You Used to," "Texas When I Die" and "San Antonio Stroll."

Her countrified version of "Delta Dawn" came out a year before Helen Reddy carried the same song to the top of the pop music charts. Even though Tucker has been singing it since 1971, the meaning of the song still mystifies her.

"After all these years, I've never figured it out. I guess the girl was jilted by the guy and he promised he'd come back and never did. The mystery is what happened to him. Was he unfaithful or did he get killed or get hurt and couldn't come back?"

But there's no doubt the song is magical: "It's a haunting melody. It's repetitions. The strangest thing is children under 5 adore the song. Children at age 3 know all the words."

Within two years of releasing the song, she was singing on Las Vegas stages at age 15 until the early morning hours, so she "dropped out" of high school to pursue her perform-

ing career full time.

In the late 1970s, she began singing rock 'n' roll and cultivated a sexpot image. An album cover showed her posing sensually with a microphone cord snaked between the legs of her skintight leather britches.

Since then, she has called that move a blunder forced upon her by others directing her career.

"Nothing has ever come easy for me," she said, reflecting on time in the spotlight as a naive teen-ager and her tabloid headlines as an adult.

"It's been an uphill climb and it doesn't get any easier for me. I've been in the business 18 years and it gets more difficult every year because there are new artists coming in having platinum albums (million sellers) and I'm still waiting for my first. My record company thinks I can have one, and I do, too."

"I don't want to be struggling and be a bummed-out country singer five years from now making 10 percent of what I used to. I want to go out in a blaze of glory or forget it."

Three weeks after giving birth, Tucker was back on the road singing country music. But her hard work was unrewarded by her peers. For the second year in a row, she was a runner up (some say snubbed) for the Country Music Association's female vocalist of the year.

"I was disappointed. I think anybody would be a fool to say they weren't. I thought I had it this year. I thought I had it last year, too. I had so many hit records out that year. Maybe they're tired of seeing my name up there."

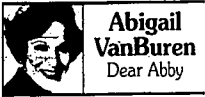

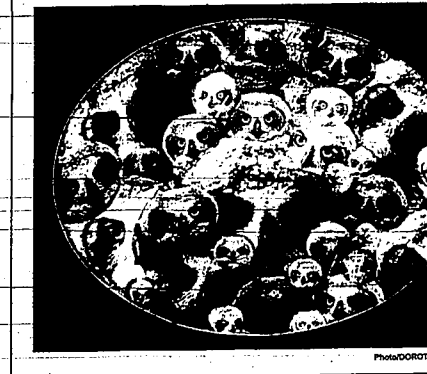

# Who, Four Tops among honorees at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame

NEW YORK (AP) — The Four Tops, the Who, five other rock 'n' roll acts, two songwriting teams and three performers considered early influences on the music were slated for induction into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

"I've been hanging out with God since I found out I was going to be here," Hank Ballard, who recorded "The Twist" before Chubby Checker did, told reporters before ceremonies scheduled at the swank Waldorf-Astoria Hotel.

The awards were announced in October in Cleveland, where the \$48 million, eight-story hall is scheduled to open in 1992. The fifth annual inductions would bring to 43 the number of rock 'n' roll acts in the Hall of Fame.

In addition to Ballard, the Four Tops and the Who, the acts being honored were Bobby Darin, who died in 1973, best known for "Splish Splash" and " Mack the Knife"; the Four Seasons; the Kinks; the Platters; and Simon and Garfunkel.

One of the songwriting teams honored, Gerry Goffin and Carole King, created their first hit "Will You Love Me Tomorrow?" for the Shirelles, and followed it with "Up on the Roof," "Loco-motion" and "Go Away Little Girl."

Brothers Brian and Eddie Holland and Lamont Dozier, a creative cornerstone of the Motown sound of the 1960s and '70s, were

honored for writing more than 70 top 10 hits. Three of their 20 No. 1 hits were "Please Mr. Postman," "You Keep Me Hangin' on" and "Stop in the Name of Love."

The three performers considered early influences on rock 'n' roll were Louis Armstrong, Charlie Christian and Ma Rainey.

Armstrong, who died in 1971, was a trumpeter and singer, and consid-

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Cheryl Ladd doesn't think an actor could ask for anything more than the conditions for filming ABC's "Jekyll & Hyde" on location in London and Oxford.

She plays Sara, the woman Dr. Henry Jekyll loves and the woman John Hyde craves. Michael Caine plays the dual role of good and evil.

"It's one of those wonderful roles that as soon as you go to work you become that character," said Ladd: "You have authentic locales, hair styles and costumes. The clothes, by the way, are extraordinarily uncomfortable."

Although set in Victorian England, the movie has a theme as contemporary as today's headlines. Jekyll was a man who believed that drugs could alter the way men think and act, for the betterment of mankind, and ease the pains of mind and body. The drugs, however, create his evil alter ego, Mr. Hyde.

The two-hour movie, which ABC telecasts on Sunday, is based loosely on Robert Louis Stevenson's classic story "The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde." The story has been portrayed many times on the screen, including Fredric March's Oscar-winning version in 1932. It's also inspired such spinoffs as Jerry Lewis' "The Nutty Professor" and television's "The Incredible Hulk." Most recently, Anthony Andrews was in a one-hour drama on Showtime.

David Wickes is the writer and director of the current version. Caine also starred in the recent "Jack the Ripper," which Wickes produced.

"There was no woman to speak of in Stevenson's story, so the love interest was created," said Ladd. "Sara's sister had been married to Jekyll, but died five years earlier."

Her father, the most pre-eminent mind mind of the day, blames Jekyll for her death because of his experimentation with drugs.

"So, I'm sort of caught between that rivalry. I try to maintain my loyalties to my father and keep my relationship with Jekyll. Although she's married she has a very public affair with Jekyll. My husband is a military officer in the South Pacific and I'm packing to join him when all hell breaks loose."

Ladd said Caine's transformation from Jekyll to Hyde is shown on the screen by means of stunning special effects.

"You watch him change, and when he becomes Hyde you'd never know it was Michael," she said.

Ladd, probably best known for "Charlie's Angels," is the only American in the cast. She plays the role with a British accent.

# Real-life lovers Montgomery, Foxworth team up for comedic African romance

"It's kind of like walking on the stars," says Elizabeth Montgomery, not of a stroll down Hollywood's Walk of Fame, but by way of describing the landscape surrounding the tent she and longtime love Robert Foxworth stayed in while they were shooting "Face to Face" (airing Wednesday, Jan. 24, on CBS) in the remote bush country of Kenya.

"Kenya has more sky than any place I've ever been," says Montgomery. "It's so big it kind of wraps around your feet. Everything about Africa—the air, the smells, the beauty of it—is like no place I'd ever seen."

The "Hallmark Hall of Fame" production is special for Montgomery, not just because it afforded her first trip to Africa, but also because it offered Montgomery and Foxworth (best known as having played Chase Gliberti on "Falcon Crest"), who have had a 15-year, real-life romance, a chance to co-star as a couple.

Montgomery plays strong-minded paleontologist Dr. Diana Firestone, who had been in hot pursuit of a very ancient—perhaps the most ancient—human skull, when her funding ran out. Returning to her dig site in Kenya, she finds Tobias Williams, an oddly-English-accented miner, excavating it in his own search for a rare clay used in making tobacco pipes.

Much like Katharine Hepburn and Humphrey Bogart in "The African Queen," Diana and Tobias ferociously bicker on and on before finally falling in love. The two characters are so sharply written by John Sweet that "Face to Face" seems more akin to a good two-character stage play than to an African travogue. Concurs Montgomery, "The characters are very funny in their own ways. Diana has complete tunnel-vision and is dedicated to getting what she wants; she has no sense of humor. And he (Tobias) has a great sense of humor and is very much a free spirit."

Montgomery says the couple had an instant reaction when they were offered the project. "I received the script and I called Bob, who was away on location. He said, 'Africa! Don't even bother to read the script! Just say you'll go.'" Montgomery recalls with a merry laugh that is eerily reminiscent of that of Samantha, her "Bewitched" character of long ago. Two weeks later, Montgomery and Foxworth found themselves ad 100 other production people camped out along a river 15 miles from the nearest town in Kenya.

"We all stayed in tents," Montgomery says. "We used the river as our bathwater. Since the river was muddy, none of us was ever really clean. But who cared?" As Diana, the 56-year-old Montgomery wears clothes that are so frumpy they'd never make it to the pages of a Banana Republic catalogue. "One windy day, I got up, washed my face and went to the makeup tent," she says. "The makeup person took one look at me and said, 'You're finished.' I loved it!"

All of the "roughing it" was compensated for by the chance to experience Africa, Montgomery says. "The innocence, the beauty, the harshness of life—it's all here. It's kind of like life in another dimension." Montgomery says that, compared to their combative characters, she and Foxworth got along beautifully. "Let's just say we didn't need separate tents."

## Once-dominant Rather slides to 3rd place

**NEW YORK (AP)**—The once-dominant "CBS Evening News," now trailing ABC's "World News Tonight" in ratings, was third last week, national audience estimates showed Tuesday.

ABC's newscast, anchored by Peter Jennings, easily won the week ending Jan. 14 with a ratings average of 11.9. It was the 12th time this season the program has triumphed over CBS's newscast, according to an ABC spokesman.

Tom Brokaw's "NBC Nightly News," which usually is in third place, was second in ratings last week with a 10.9 average, edging out Rather's newscast, which was third by a narrow margin of one-tenth of a ratings point.

According to the A.C. Nielsen Co., each ratings point represents 921,000 homes.

CBS officials had no immediate explanation for Rather's third place finish, which last happened in the final week of December.

according to CBS.

Last week, one major CBS affiliate, KPDX-TV in San Francisco, shifted Rather's program to an earlier 5:30 p.m. PST start time.

But it isn't known yet if that was a factor in the week's Nielsen returns for the program, said Michael Eisenberg, CBS vice president for audience measurement.

"We couldn't point to that as the only reason right now," he said in an interview Tuesday. "We're studying the matter and trying to find out what the reasons are."

In a news conference in Los Angeles over the weekend, Rather said, "I intend to keep right on keeping on. It's true, the CBS Evening News is a work in progress... we're constantly trying to improve."

Asked about his delivery of the news from a standing position, the anchorman said, "I've always wanted to stand and do the broadcast. I don't think that's cosmetic."

# Arveson holds on to 'Y&R' spotlight

It took Nina Arveson two and a half years to crack "The Young and the Restless" lineup, but now her wily character of Cassandra is never off camera. Involved in a nasty little murder triangle, a storyline that was supposed to be over last summer, Nina Arveson is still front and center. She flashes that handsome profile as Cassie melodramatically faces the law for plotting her husband's murder, while setting up her lover, Paul (Doug Davidson) as the chief suspect.

January was supposed to be Jeanne Cooper's month on "Y&R," not Nina's. Jeanne's Kay Chancellor is kidnapped in a hare-brained scheme, but there is Cassie horning in, still getting mileage out of the never-ending murder yarn. Blame it on the writers, not Nina.

Last November Nina was stopping traffic in Bermuda during the five-day location shooting when Cassie and her associate Adrian were being tracked by Paul and his dad Carl, trying to scare Cassie into admitting her guilt.

"We're No. 1 in Bermuda," Arveson reports. "We used to be on at 5 p.m. Everyone wanted to leave work early to catch the show, so they had to move it to 6 p.m. For some reason, the show is very popular in hot climates like Trinidad, Teheran and Australia."

But not in Norway, where Nina spent a decade before realizing Hollywood was the place for a working actress. Born in New York, the daughter of Norway's current ambassador to Central America (stationed in Costa Rica), Nina grew up in Manhattan, Egypt and Brazil. One brother studies film at the University of Texas while another brother works in Norway's stock market.

Asked about Central America's troubles and the U.S. "big brother" stance, Nina quietly replies, "I'm not the right person to answer that." She's an actress, not a foreign affairs expert.

Nina knows better, but she isn't above knocking Norway. "It's too

cold, too dark, and the winters are too long. I'm spoiled by L.A. I love it. I've made it my home," Nina says, always the diplomat.

She intends to remain on "The Young and the Restless" for some time, not jump into the movies. "This show is technically beyond most soap operas. Our stories are stronger."

"The Young and the Restless" — the home of the beautiful people. Nina and her carved cheekbones are part of the tradition. Prompted by her Scandinavian determination, Nina believes that once you've found your niche, you hold on for

dear life.

# NBC holds on to top place after ABC's 'Roseanne' leaps past 'Cosby,' 'Cheers'

LOS ANGELES (AP) — ABC's "Roseanne" moved ahead of NBC's "The Cosby Show" and "Cheers" to take possession of first place in the Nielsen television ratings for the week ended Jan. 14.

"Roseanne" was more than three ratings points ahead of "Cosby" and four ahead of third-place "Cheers."

But NBC kept a firm grip on first place among the networks, while CBS held onto second place by a narrow margin over third-place ABC. NBC had an average of 15.4 in the A.C. Nielsen Co. survey, CBS 13.4 and ABC 13.2.

In the season to date, NBC leads with 14.8, ABC is second with 12.9 and CBS third with 12.2. A rating represents the percentage of the nation's 92.1 million television homes tuned to a show.

NBC and CBS listed as first in their versions of the ratings the prime time rerun of CBS' coverage of the NFL pro football playoff game between the Los Angeles Rams and the San Francisco 49ers. San Francisco's victory put them into the Super Bowl.

Although the game is not on the official Nielsen list, the post-game show on CBS tied for seventh place with NBC's "Empty Nest."

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For example, Democratic Rep. Richard Gephardt rated a few mentions on the evening news for his congressional work on the federal tax code — including a hotly debated bill that bore his name — but it took his bid for the presidency in 1988 to make his face and name familiar on TV.

Likewise, Sens. Albert Gore Jr., Lloyd Bentsen, Paul Simon and Dan Quayle found that mention on the three networks — CBS, NBC and ABC — was the result of their political aspirations rather than the nuts-and-bolts doings in Congress.

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But that number skyrocketed to 172 in 1987-88, the congressional session that included his election as vice president. Quayle wasn't a formal candidate until George Bush made him one, but the pattern was the same among Democratic presidential hopefuls.

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Gore ranked second in the 100th Congress with 209 mentions, Simon was third with 200 and Bentsen of Texas, the 1988 Democratic vice presidential candidate, was fourth with 199. During 1985-86, Bentsen had managed just 14 mentions.

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Sen. Sam Nunn, D-Ga., the chairman of the Armed Services Committee, was sixth with 155 mentions and Sen. Robert Byrd, D-W.Va., Senate majority leader at the time, was seventh with 144 mentions.

At the bottom of the list with no mentions from 1987 to 1988 were Sens. Quentin Burdick, D-N.D.; Wendell Ford, D-Ky., and Harry Reid, D-Nev.

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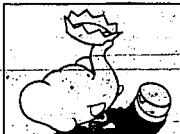
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
