Under the present system, Wood and two assistants represent all criminal defendants who ean't afford a private lawyer.


Commissioners have considered replacing Wood and his Staff, who are county-employees, with a private law from tho poes of saving money.

Cosmonauts take 'motorcycle' ride

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviet cosmonauts left the Mir orbital station on Monday for high-flying acrobatics on a space motorcycle designed to rescue spacemen in distress and repair safefiltes.

Cosmonauts Alexander Viktorenko and Alexander Serebrov, who have been aboard the Mir complet for nearly five months, churried from Mir for a second test of the motorcycle, officially known as the Cosmonaut Movement System, the official news agent Tass said. The space motorcycle, which more closely resembles a floating armchair, was ridden for the first time Thursday by Serebrov, who piloted the device about 100 feet from the giant Mir space station.



To me the answer is to keep one truth uppermost in our minds. Good health is, at best, the means to a satisfying. Illic, not an end in itself.

The curious feature of good health is that when we have it, we do not notice it. Invisibility is, so to speak, its main symptom. The more we consciously focus on good health,—the more we remove that invisibility—Most of the time we have something arong, with us, if only a mild case of the sniffles. To the extent that we focus on those ills, they take us captive. As Barsky has nicely put it,—The feeling of physical well-being is elusive in the same way that happinessy is, it is more a byproduct of successful living than it is an objective that can be attained by striving for it objectively.

The social distortion of an endless quest for improved health is no less damaging to society, Man to individuals, While there is no doubt that a large number of poor people suffer from poor health, most middle-class

damaging to society than to individuals. While there is no doubt that a large number of poor people suffer from poor health, most middle-class Americans are in fine shape; perfectly able to work to love and to play. Yet we continue pouring money into medical research and care as if we work in the midst of a great plague. We do not need perfect health to run our political and legislative system, or to have a strong, competitive work force, or to educate ourselves. We probably already have a sufficiently high leyed of general health for most purposes in this vountry. If through national health instrance, we could take care of the poor, we would then have more than enough. Since we all know people who are sick and dying, how can i say such a thing? I say it because illness, decline and death are part of the human experience, an integral part of our very biology. No matter how much medical progress we make, there will allways be people who are ill and dying—later rather than sooner, one hopes, but always in evitably.

evitably.

The task of keeping people alive, of curing their ills, is an endless and infinite one, no less so than the possibilities for exploring outer space.

Whatever we do, there will always be more to be done, and then more still.

We need, both as individuals and We need, both as individuals and as a society, to come to grips with this reality. Our failure to confront it helps to explain why we remain dissatisfied in the face of great progress, why we can feel at risk, despite good health. We have managed to persuade ourselves that sufficient progressing the progression of t


sto persuade ourselves that sufficient personal vigilance and ever-impersonal vigilance and ever-improved medical care can free us of illness and death. Yet we must know in our bearts that this is not true; in fact, this attitude will probably just make us feel worse.

What is the best-way to remain in good health? We have known the answer for a long time. First, think—of something other than sickness and death, and then early leger a good might's sleep and exercise moderate-by. Has there ever been any better prescription?

Too many people believe that the rescue squad or emergency medical service is only a phone call away. They fail to realize that time is critical!

The American Heart Association's statistics show that if someone has cardiac arrest and CPR is delayed, every second after four minutes is cri-ical. There are mirraculous exceptions — especially-in cold-water drowning cases involving children. However, when CPR is delayed beyond about six minutes, there is a very high probability of per-nament brain damage.

From the moment a victim's heart stops, it can take more than four minutes for someone to reach a phone, dial the number and tell the dispatcher who, what, when and where. Newhart buys home with 6 baths Geraldo vows to shake

Actor and comedian Bob Newhart, star of the 7-year-old CBS sitcom "Newhart," wanted more land than he has at his current Los Angeles home, so he found another house a few blocks away on 1.3 acres.

He and his wife, Virginia, are buying it for \$4.2 million, say sources not involved in real estate

The price is considered bargain for the neighborhood, as the house is on one of the choicest streets in the old part of the posh-Bel-Air neighborhood. But the house is said to be a tear-down or a rehab

This could be one of those rare opportunities to create a major estate," said one of the sources.

The house - a two-story country-English style with seven bedrooms and six baths in 6.110 square feet - was built in 1941. It
