Air Force issues Saylor rare statement

WASHINGTON - A draft environmental impact statement says a proposed Air Force bombing range expansion could have a potentially significant impact on southern Idaho by restricting grazing and mining in the area, reducing private land ownership and restricting access to water.

The draft EIS also said the proposed expansion's potential to disturb habitats and cause fires throughout the expanded range could have a significant impact on wildlife. The Air Force Thursday mailed out copies of the statement for the proposed Saylor Creek bombing range expansion, marking the start of the plan's formal review process. The draft EIS - which the Air Force calls the "First Tier" in a two-stage study process - describes the potential impacts of the range expansion as well as expansion of operations at the Mountain Home Air Force Base.

The Air Force plans to move 94 F-4 jet fighters to Idaho from a California, congressionally mandated consolidated military base. The move will nearly double the number of planes currently stationed at the base. Details of range expansion plans, however, were not included. They will be addressed in the second tier EIS if the Air Force decides to continue the range expansion review process, the Air Force said. Only at that point would the Air Force draw range maps and identify specific boundaries for the proposed expansion. The Air Force hopes to complete the Tier One EIS process and make a decision on

the second stage of the EIS process by July. The Air Force last fall proposed to expand the southern Idaho bombing range from 100,000 to 1.5 million acres. That proposal included supersonic flights and the use of five bombs. But a series of "scoping hearings," the Air Force's plan ran into strong opposition from area residents. Public hearings on the draft environmental impact statement are planned for Twin Falls, Boise, Mountain Home, Grand View and Glenns Ferry during the week of April 2-7. Specific dates have not been set.

The public will have 45 days from the department's official announcement of the draft Tier One EIS release on March 2 to comment on it. Copies of the document will be available at local sites, including the College of Southern Idaho Library, the Twin Falls County Courthouse, Sun Valley and Kelechum city halls, the DeMary Memorial Public Library in Rupert and the Burley High School Library. Comments and questions received during the 45-day public comment period will be addressed in the final EIS.

Andrus asks former Demo party leader to give up state post

BOISE - Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus asked former state Democratic Party Chairman Mel Morgan to retire as state highway safety director on Thursday. Andrus acted after discovering Morgan was involved in an unauthorized attempt to place suspended Transportation Director Kermit Kiebert back on the state payroll under "sick leave."

Morgan, who was reportedly in Sun Valley and could not be reached for comment, maintained in a memorandum to acting Transportation Director George Neumayer that Board Chairman Marion "Swede" Davidson, a former Democratic state lawmaker, had directed him to facilitate the payroll change. Morgan's office said he had taken vacation leave and would not be back until next Tuesday. Batt said Davidson was returning from Arizona and would be back in the state on Monday.

But while Andrus was instrumental in getting Morgan the job some 18 months ago, he emphasized that Morgan works for the Board of Transportation and it will be the board's responsibility to take any appropriate action. Board member Phil Batt, the former Republican lawmaker and lieutenant governor who brought the problem to the governor's attention, said it appeared the board would meet on the matter early next week, possibly Monday. "It will have to be very soon," Batt said. "We want to clear the air."

It was the second questionable incident involving the Morgan family and the administration this year. The governor became involved earlier after he found out Morgan's son was hired for a state Employment Department job in Pocatello requiring fluency in Spanish when he had no Spanish skills. Reagan's testimony may hurt Poindexter

WASHINGTON - Ronald Reagan's videotaped deposition gave Iran-Contra prosecutors new ammunition for the trial of John M. Poindexter even though the former president tried hard to help his former national security adviser. Reagan endorsed the truthfulness of a letter Poindexter wrote to Congress assuring lawmakers that White House aides were not helping the Nicaraguans rebels in violation of a congressional ban. The former president, who winked and nodded at Poindexter when he took the witness stand, said he was "in total agreement" with the letter and hadn't authorized anything but the truth. But Iran-Contra prosecutors charge the letter was a false statement to Congress. And if they can convince Poindexter's jury that that, Reagan's statements about what he did or didn't authorize

could be a problem for his former aide. Prosecutor Dan Webb said to Reagan concerning the truthfulness of the letter, "You do understand that it is a matter that ultimately the jury will have an opportunity to determine in this case, don't you?" U.S. District Judge Harold Greene ordered that remark stricken from the record, but the jury in Poindexter's case will in all likelihood face that question. Part of Poindexter's defense, as outlined in court papers, is that he had no reason to lie to Congress because his activities were authorized by the president. But Reagan, during cross-examination by Webb, said he never authorized Poindexter to lie to Congress about the Iran-Contra affair. Feds take over; Benj. Franklin carries on

TWIN FALLS - A local thrift is carrying on business as usual despite a federal takeover - even to the point of being host to a chamber of commerce open house. Federal regulators say the Benj. Franklin Federal Savings and Loan Association couldn't meet new fed-

eral guidelines adopted after the national savings and loan crisis. "We're still operating as Benjamin Franklin," Assistant Vice President Deborah Andrews told the chamber crowd. "We feel a real positive move will come out of all this." Other local savings and loan officials said Benj. Franklin customers shouldn't panic. First Federal Savings Bank

President Richard Allen met with his tellers Thursday morning. He told them to "tell anyone who asks (about Benj. Franklin) not to panic if they have money over there."

Washington Federal Savings and Loan Manager Jeff Harris commented, "I don't think it should cause any panic for their customers," he said. The timing was a little uncomfortable for the thrift's local branch - the federal Office of Thrift Supervision announced the move one day before Franklin's Twin Falls branch was to be the host at an open house for Twin Falls Area Chamber of Commerce members. The Thrift Supervision office has named as conservator the Resolution Trust Corp., created last August to dispose of failed S&Ls. The trust will eventually try to sell Oregon-based Franklin or merge it with another thrift, said Kevin Shields, a Portland-based spokesman for the corporation. Regulators said Franklin would maintain normal business hours and stressed that all deposits - up to \$100,000 are guaranteed. The institution has \$3.2 billion in deposits in 448,612 accounts. Despite overall assets of \$5.4 billion, the thrift failed to meet the capital requirements of the new savings and loan law and was determined to be operating in an unsafe and unsound condition, regulators said. A key part of Franklin's problem was an intangible capital category stemming in part from the move that brought it into the Twin Falls market. In 1982, Franklin took over. See FRANKLIN on Page A2

Hagerman loses its lone police officer in dispute over conduct

HAGERMAN - The city's one-man police force has quit. In a split decision decided by the mayor, the city has accepted the resignation of Carl Ellis, hired in October. If city officials want "the rowdies" to run the town, they can accept his resignation, Ellis told the City Council Tuesday. If they want the town run by a professional police officer, he said, they can reject it. Council members Audrey Hoffman and

Gloria Jazwick voted to reject the resignation, saying that Ellis has done the job he was hired to do. Council members Rolly Zollinger and Mike Withner voted to accept Ellis' resignation, saying local citizens have said the officer has been unnecessarily rude. Mayor Marle Owsley broke the council's tie vote by accepting the resignation. "We had a lot of complaints," Owsley said. "I was called at my home two or three times and we had some people show up at council meetings to complain about him."

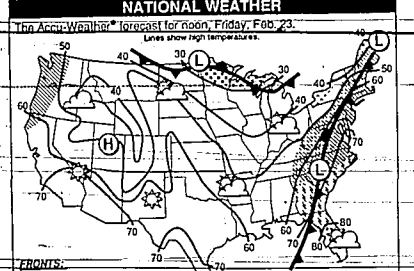
But in Congress some members said the Seattle decision showed that Congress didn't do enough in passing legislation to outlaw flag burning and should now initiate a constitutional amendment.

U.S. District Judge Barbara Rothstein ruled in Seattle Wednesday that the new federal law is unconstitutional and dismissed flag-burning charges against four demonstrators. Federal prosecutors say they may appeal the ruling to the Supreme Court.

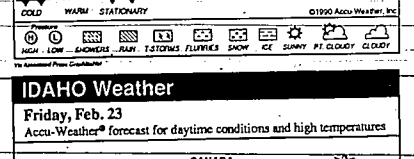

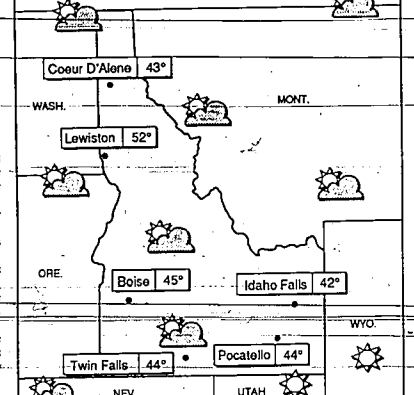

"We had to step in and change that," Andrus said during a session with the Idaho Press Club. "I deeply regret that this is becoming one of those controversial things. But if you're in this administration, you're not going to 'Mickey Mouse' the system."

Dispute over police investigation boils

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Idaho Falls police officers did not have the right to investigate a crane accident at the Anheuser-Busch maling plant construction site that left four workers injured, Mayor Tom Campbell says.

But Police Chief Monte Montague and Bonneville County Prosecutor Kimball Mason disagree.

According to a police report filed on the accident, two Idaho Falls officers were assigned by Anheuser-Busch construction supervisor Bill Krummsman to leave the site without conducting an investigation. The officers refused.

Montague said the patrolmen did what he would expect by honoring Krummsman's request to keep reporters and photographers off company property Tuesday after two cranes collapsed.

Businessmen want to build 'new town'

BOISE (AP) — One of Idaho's ten-largest towns would materialize out of the empty desert south of Boise if two Ada County businessmen can get permission for the project.

Ron Yanke and Tom Nicholson are proposing a change in county land-use regulations to allow for a 12,000-resident "new town" south of the Boise strip.

Called Woodland Park, it would turn a 3-square-mile tract covered with sagebrush and grasses into a community, complete with schools, an 18-hole golf course, a lake, a park and commercial development.

Court reverses drug case conviction

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Supreme Court has overturned the conviction on a second Hispanic man in a drug case on the grounds that the jury understood English to realize the consequences of his guilty plea.

Moises Rodriguez was arrested with two other men in Madison County in 1986. He pleaded innocent to four counts of delivery and possession of cocaine and heroin. Rodriguez then again appeared in court to change his plea from innocent to guilty on the two counts alleging unlawful delivery, in return for which prosecutors dropped the unlawful possession charges.

After 7th District Judge William Black sentenced him to a 30-year indeterminate term, Rodriguez filed a motion to withdraw his guilty plea on the grounds he did not understand the rights he was waiving or the results of his plea.

Historians see 1989 as most decisive

POCATELLO (AP) — Historians will view 1989 as the most decisive year in the last half of the 20th century, a West-German ambassador has told Idaho State University's Frank Church Symposium.

"History tends to mark bleak spots, disasters and the decline of empires," but 1989 was a watershed year for the victory of democracy over communism, free market forces over central planning, and the will of the people over dictatorship, Karl Paschke said on Thursday.

"Last year, if I would have predicted only half the events that have occurred in Eastern Europe, people would have thought I was nuts," said Paschke, who also attended the symposium last year.

INEL disputes alleged waste violations

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — The Idaho National Engineering Laboratory disputes nearly half of the 28 alleged hazardous waste violations cited by the Environmental Protection Agency.

In a letter to the EPA, Department of Energy officials disagree with 11 of the alleged violations reported from a June inspection at the INEL. They say some of the problems never occurred, and some did not involve wastes, but materials used for processing.

On Jan. 29, the EPA gave the Energy Department 20 days to respond to the charges. The DOE laid out its response in a letter dated Tuesday.

In a few cases, the Energy Department said it planned to use some of the materials the EPA considered waste.

House panel blocks cash for highways

BOISE (AP) — Contending state government will need a "fiscal cushion" when times turn bad, a House committee has killed a bid to use \$25 million from a beefed-up "rainy day account" for Idaho's crumbling local highways and bridges.

"We're going to have another turnaround and we're going to need some of those bucks to avoid a shortfall," Rep. Richard Adams, D-Boise, said Thursday in opposing the measure before the House Transportation and Defense Committee.

The panel agreed, voting 9-5 to hold the bill sponsored by Rep. Boyd Hill, R-Meridian. It would have allocated one-time money directly to highway districts, with no strings attached, to begin addressing their most critical road and bridge problems.

Committee members then voted 6-8 against recommending full House passage of a scaled-back \$12 million version of the same plan.



However, that bill could be reconsidered later, and Hill said he hopes to bring it up along with measures sponsored by Rep. Sheila Sorensen, R-Boise, to allocate \$10 million in one-time money and a continuing funding mechanism for bridge repairs statewide.

Like the \$25 million plan, the other one-time funding measures would have taken the money from \$38 million the Joint Finance Appropriations Committee has recommended be added to the state's \$12 million Budget Reserve Account. Budget writers, who have rejected similar diversions, have tentatively earmarked the additional reserve money from the state's record \$126.3 million cash surplus for the current spending year.

School bond resolution endorsed

BOISE (AP) — The House Education Committee has endorsed a call for a constitutional amendment to lower from two-thirds to 60 percent the required vote to approve school district bonds.

With just two dissenting votes, the panel sent the joint resolution, sponsored by Rep. Jim Hansen, D-Boise, to the full House for action Thursday.

Only Republican Reps. Dick Davis of Rexburg and John Sessions of Driggs voted against recommending full House passage of the resolution.

Testimony from school officials and representatives of the Boise and Pocatello chambers of commerce was overwhelmingly behind changing a two-thirds provision in Idaho's Constitution since statehood.

Idaho firm to help build collider

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Energy Department on Thursday chose a three-firm consortium including an Idaho firm to design and build the super collider in what officials described as the first step of the decade toward construction of the world's largest scientific instrument.

The consortium, led by the firm of Parsons Brinckerhoff Quade & Douglas Inc. of New York City, must still negotiate details of the \$1 billion contract. Also on the team are Morrison Knudsen Corp. of Boise, Idaho, and CRSS Inc. of Houston, officials said.

Chosen from three finalist teams of firms, the consortium would be the architect, engineer and construction manager for the high-energy physics particle accelerator and laboratory to be built south of Dallas in Ellis County.

The Energy Department said the contractor would be responsible for designing and building the physical facilities for the superconducting super collider. The award would be the largest single contract involved in building the collider, which may cost more than \$7 billion.

DOE said it will take about 8 to 12 years to design, engineer and build the facilities at the SSC.

Idaho Andrus allows rule bill to become law

BOISE (AP) — State lawmakers have finally won power to block administrative rules they object to, ending at least for now the constitutional debate over legislative authority to veto agency regulations.

Gov. Cecil Andrus allowed the controversial bill to become law Thursday without his signature, expressing his concern about whether the new procedure is viable while promising nonetheless to help make it work.

"There has been a philosophical difference of opinion for some years," Andrus said. "At the same time, I do not feel that we can ignore the

concern of legislators who have some lack of agreement with rules that have been passed." Under the bill, effective July 1, all administrative rules on the books will expire on July 1, 1991, unless reauthorized by the Legislature. After that, all rules will expire annually unless reauthorized by lawmakers.

Since the early 1980s, the Legislature has been looking for a way to gain control over administrative rules agencies issue to implement the details of bills lawmakers enact.

Attempts to use a concurrent resolution have been labeled as an unconstitutional invasion.

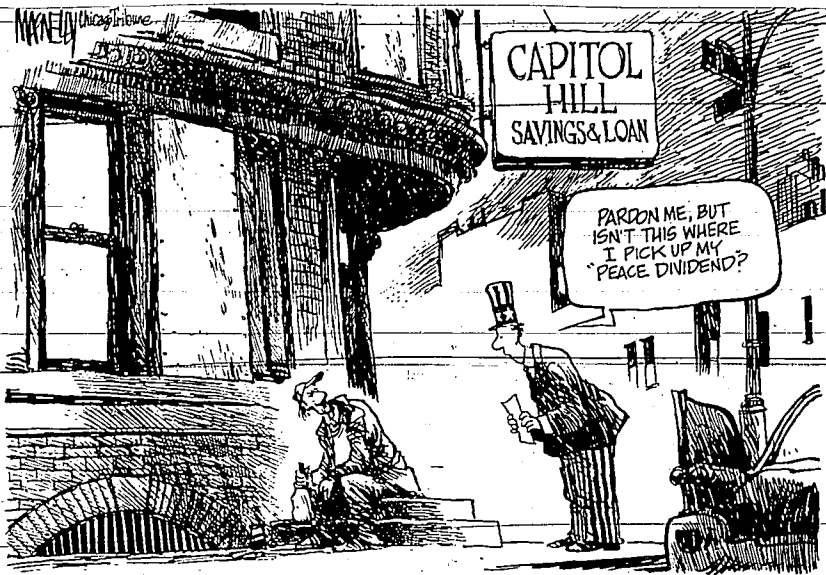

School hirings should include the public

Before Twin Falls and Jerome School Boards make important decisions this spring about who will lead their districts as superintendents, each has another decision to make:

Will they let the public in on the selection process?

It's a legitimate question. Often, when elected boards and commissions hire central administrators, they carry on the whole process behind closed doors.

Resume checking and interviews are traditionally conducted by board members themselves, and not surprisingly, the process is less than thorough.

Particularly in the closed fraternity of school superintendents, it is not uncommon for one district to "send someone down the road" with what amounts to a let's-not-talk-about-the-past agreement.

That, combined with poor hiring practices on the part of board, often means the hiring community winds up with an individual who has been another district's problem.

Only after the contract has been signed and the new superintendent "presented" to the community do the taxpayers find out anything about the high-priced talent they're paying for, and by then, it may be too late.

But it doesn't need to be that way. Enlightened public governing boards can adopt some of the methods used widely in private industry to involve constituent groups from the beginning in the search process.

Citizens committees can help recruit candidates, help set selection criteria and help narrow the field to a handful of finalists.

More significantly, when finalists arrive for interviews, at least part of the quizzing goes on in a public setting. Citizens can hear their answers and ask some of the questions.

In the case of Twin Falls, that would be an ideal role for the Chamber of Commerce's new education committee. That committee could be an ideal vehicle by which the board could broaden its community input.

The pluses for such an approach are straightforward. A school superintendent is the central manager of a vitally important public institution. Schools have as much to do with a community's future as any public or private organization. The taxpayers have a right to be in on such a crucial hiring choice.

There may be several objections to an open process. One is that good candidates will shy away from a public grilling — and that many applicants need secrecy because they don't want their current bosses to know they are job shopping. But the answer to that is that a school administrator who is afraid to face the public has no business being in the business.

As for secrecy, nobody hires a top manager without checking references, although more than one school superintendent has been hired in this valley in recent years without an adequate background check. By the final interview stage, the candidate's current and past employers obviously should be consulted.

Apart from the philosophical ideal of openness in local government, public participation has decided advantages for a school district. Any possible objections to a candidate can be aired before the decision. The winning candidate can start the job with confidence of at least nominal public support.

Of course, involving the public doesn't take the board off the hook. It alone must make the choice and bear the responsibility. But bringing the citizens into the process raises the chances of a successful conclusion.

Both Twin Falls and Jerome school districts are at important junctures in improving both internal relations among teachers and administrators and at eliminating internal "politics" from the process.

Broad community involvement in the selection of each superintendent is an important ingredient which both boards, in our view, should seek.

Some Twin Falls school system decisions seem to take place in private, not public

Close your eyes and dream just a minute. Dream that you have just won the lottery and pocketed \$18 million. Now, open your eyes and figure out what you will do next.

After thinking this over, let's say we decided to place this money into the hands of a board of trustees. We give them one order they must follow in handling this money. That requirement is that no plans or decisions about its management can be made in the open. This way, we won't know what they are doing with our money.

This is the plan we most likely would not stand for. However, is this not what we have done in Twin Falls with our school system?

After attending board meetings for over a year's time period, I have concluded that a group must be afraid of the public. Attendance is based only on regular scheduled meetings because the only way to know of special meetings is to daily check the Administration Building's door.

It seems that if problems are brought to their attention at regular meetings, there will be no answer given to you.

They are happy to listen to you but I have yet to see a response or even a question from any of the members present, except on issues that the school district wants action on.

This confuses me since these people are elected representatives of the tax-paying public who send them about \$18 million dollars a year to spend to educate our children.

Please don't misunderstand. I realize that there are times when executive sessions are needed, but it has always been my feeling that this should be reserved for discussions pertaining to personnel problems, disciplinary actions or land purchases.

Because I have seen no action during open sessions on many issues brought before the board I can only guess that if there is discussion, it must be happening in executive session or not at all.

There is nothing wrong with being fiscally conservative with public funds. However, this may be carried too far when it results in our schools starting to hurt show signs of serious problems.

As times change, our schools have been mandated with an increasing number of programs which are new and different than what education was in the past.

With change of this nature, a necessary change of attitude of those in charge must also take place. Complaining about how these programs are causing problems is not the proper manner to handle these changes. Neither is implementing them in a minimal manner or a manner which is inadequate just so you may say you have done what is required.

When this happens, you no longer have people taking care of the district's responsibilities. Instead, you have caretakers only. Caretakers are fine if you only want to maintain the status quo of our educational system. If you want people who desire our educational system to produce graduates that are ready to enter the world or to have a school district that is not "non-accredited" in many areas, you must not settle for caretakers.

Twin Falls is fortunate. It is a growing area. This has caused our school system to grow to where it is operating at or near capacity. This will

cause some very important decisions to be made in the near future. We as citizens need to actively participate in these decisions. The wrong decisions could severely hurt our area and our children. This is not a time for apathy. It is everyone's duty to become involved.

Dr. Tolzin has, during the last year, worked very hard to try to set process many plans that would lead us toward a better school system. He needs to be recognized for his efforts to do this.

Unfortunately, to date, he has not applied for a permanent status as school superintendent. This may prove to be very unfortunate for Twin Falls. I do not know why he has not applied. I only hope that it is not because our current board has members on it which are resistant to change.

One board member once indicated to me that, they needed to be careful of bringing someone in from "the outside." This brings concern and tends to make me question whether our caretakers want progress.

Soon it will be time to elect new trustees. My earnest desire is for people to look over the situation and consider what you can do for Twin Falls. Don't hesitate to get involved. If you wish to see change or even progress, the board has a position for you. Please help!

The rest of us must actively participate also. We must not let apathy get in your way. Vote on election day, the future of our children is in your hands.

Thank you for your letter on the solid waste disposal problem.

Your letter illustrates an ongoing grave problem for many small communities that has nothing to do with solid waste.

The solid waste disposal package envisions a set fund to be paid to each county and then a sum based upon census figures.

I submit to you that the census information is significantly in error.

Please note the census information concerning Camas County. You will find the figure of 600. In the 1980 census, the physical count indicated 800. That is a 25 percent difference.

For the last 18 months, I have been trying to find out how the 600 figure was computed.

To put it mildly, I have received a run-

around. According to the Camas County clerk, there were 830 registered voters in Camas County in 1980 — plus high school, grade school and pre-school. This is a small community.

We who live here have a very good idea of the goings and comings of people. No leader in the community has any faith whatsoever in the 600 figure.

Though we have not done an official count, we are more than confident that if we did, the results would be closer to the 800 figure rather than the 600 figure.

I realize in the solid waste bill, the population figure will be based on the 1990 census.

However, from inquiries I have made, I believe we public officials are not receiving

correct information from the Bureau of Census.

What is the basis for the imputation of population figures by the Bureau of Census?

Who determines the basis and the final figures?

My community, as well as those you represent and the state of Idaho, receives significant sums of money based upon census figures.

If they are 25 percent detrimentally wrong, as in Camas County's case, how can there be any assurance they are correct or even close to correct for your communities of the state?

Half those infected don't have AIDS

ATLANTA (AP) — An estimated 1 million Americans are infected with the AIDS virus and about half of them — those who haven't actually developed the disease — may benefit from treatment with the drug AZT, researchers said Thursday.

Although the increase in AIDS has slowed since 1987, the number of Americans infected with the AIDS, or HIV, virus is up 33 percent from about 750,000 three years ago, the Federal Centers for Disease Control said.

About 60 percent of the infected people have low levels of critical immune system cells called T-4 cells — including about 500,000 who do not yet suffer from AIDS, the CDC said.

Those people may benefit from early treatment with AZT, or zidovudine, the agency said. "Recent studies indicate that early treatment with zidovudine can slow disease progression" in people with no AIDS symptoms, the CDC said.

Atlantis launch delayed for 2nd day



CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — NASA on Thursday delayed the launch of Atlantis for a second day to let the shuttle's commander recover from a sore throat and to await better weather.

The secret military mission to put a spy satellite in orbit is not expected to take off until Saturday morning at the earliest.

The shuttle originally was scheduled for a fiery pre-dawn liftoff Thursday but was postponed Wednesday when Navy Capt. John O. Creighton became ill, the second time the space program has delayed a flight because of a sick astronaut.

ANC arms upset civil rights veterans

ATLANTA (AP) — Civil rights veterans who for decades have carried the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.'s banner of non-violence are uneasy over Nelson Mandela's refusal to renounce violence but are reluctant to criticize the South African.

For colleagues and followers of King, the release of Mandela this month after 27 years in prison has posed something of a moral dilemma. As longtime opponents of apartheid, they are joyful over Mandela's freedom. But the refusal by Mandela and the African National Congress to rule out the use of arms is at odds with the non-violent philosophy espoused by King.

GAO calls for limits on B-2 bomber

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congress should limit spending on the B-2 bomber because of doubts about the aircraft's ability to pass critical tests and a likely increase in the program's \$70 billion price tag, an investigative agency said Thursday.

The General Accounting Office, however, emphasized that such a step must be accompanied by an analysis by Defense Secretary Dick Cheney and the plane's contractor, Northrop Corp., to determine the cost of a delay in production. Cheney should provide Congress with the study of alternative plans for acquiring the radar-evading aircraft, considered the most expensive in history at a cost of \$530 million apiece, the GAO said.

Japanese understand U.S. troop cut

TOKYO (AP) — Japanese officials informed by Defense Secretary Dick Cheney that tight budgets will force cuts in the 50,000 U.S. troops stationed here reacted Thursday by calling the plan "prudent and appropriate." Cheney, in a daylong series of meetings with top Japanese officials, also sought increases in the \$2.4 billion annual support for the American military based here, but no specific figures were discussed or agreed upon, officials said.

Airlines backing law requiring child seats

WASHINGTON (AP) — The airline industry changed its position on infant safety seats Thursday and asked the government to require them for all passengers under 2 years old.

The proposal, if adopted by the Federal Aviation Administration, could require thousands of parents each day to buy tickets for children who now fly free. Airlines, however, still would have the option of offering free rides or reduced fares.

The Air Transport Association, representing major air carriers, prepared a petition asking the FAA to take a tougher stand than the agency is considering. The airline group previously encouraged infant seat use but opposed rules to require them.

FAA rules now allow infants to be held in the arms of adult passengers, but recent crashes in which unsecured infants were killed while some other passengers escaped have raised "new" concerns among passenger groups, flight attendants and members of Congress.

Most infant car seats are approved by the FAA for airliner use.

The FAA is considering a rule that would require airlines to accept safety seats on all flights. Airlines now have the option to refuse them.

The FAA has resisted calls for tougher rules, partly because of the cost to parents and the low number of infant casualties in airliner accidents. Some officials have argued that raising costs so families would drive rather than fly with infants would "subject them" to greater risk than flying without an infant seat.

On Capitol Hill, Rep. Jim Lightfoot, R-Iowa, and Sen. Christopher Bond, R-Mo., held a news conference they expect airline

industry support for legislation that would order the FAA to require the seats.

"If you have a corpse on an airplane, it has to be tied down," said Lightfoot, "but a kid can be left to fly free around the cabin."

Both House and Senate bills would force the FAA to require infant seats on all flights, but the measures do not address the issue of ticketing for passengers or say who would provide the seats.

Lightfoot said he assumed passengers would bring their own seats, since state laws require their use for youngsters in automobiles that take them to the airport.

Baker cool to Nicaragua

WASHINGTON (AP) — He also said the Bush administration reserves the right to decide on its own if the election is fair.

Baker, appearing before the House Foreign Affairs Committee, said the administration would insist on "a substantial period of good behavior" before there can be normal relations with the United States.

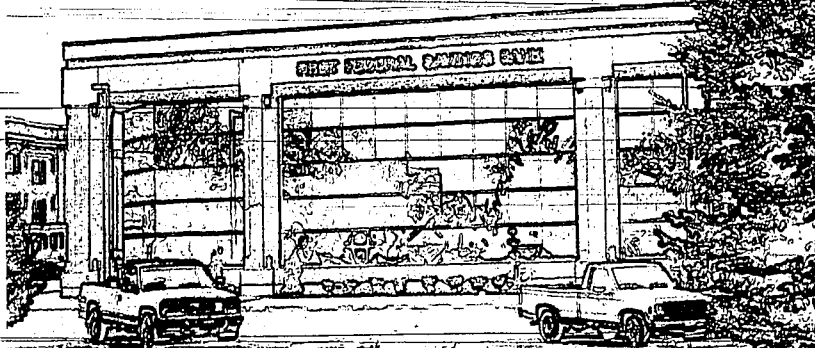

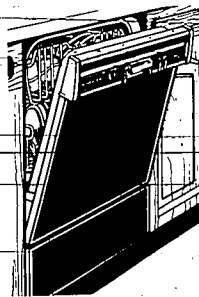

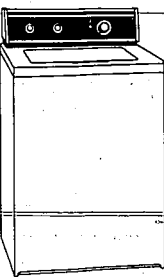

Senate to child sex abusers: Take 5 in the pen

BOISE — Legislation slapping a minimum mandatory five-year prison term on child sex abusers cleared the Senate Thursday.

The bill, described as the capstone of the bipartisan campaign to "better punish the offenders and treat the victims," would require convicted child molesters to serve at least five years in prison if charged with one of three aggravating circumstances: the victim is 7 years old or younger, the offenders have previous child molestation convictions or had child pornography in their possession at the time of the crime.



Committee last week. Sen. Joyce McRoberts, R-Twin Falls, nearly convinced the committee to send the bill to the floor without the 7-year-old provision.

The measure will have an even rockier time making it through the House Judiciary, Rules and Administration Committee, where past mandatory minimum sentencing bills have been buried.

A series of bills were enacted last year to improve treatment of child abuse victims and enhance the chances of prosecutors to obtain convictions. This year's call for mandatory minimum sentencing is a scaled-back version of a proposal that failed last session.

Darrington said he thought the bill would pass the Senate without any problems. But he and Brooks will next have to face Rep. Celia Gould, R-Buhl, and other members of a sentencing subcommittee who considered, and rejected mandatory minimum sentencing legislation.

Following Thursday's Senate vote, Gould said she is "quite sure" the House will amend the measure to take out the call for mandatory five-year sentences for anyone convicted of sexually abusing a child under age 7.

Gould said that she fears the provision will hinder reporting of child sex abuse. In addition, she said, the committee concluded

Glenns Ferry seeks industrial park grant funds

GLENN'S FERRY — The city will apply for a grant to provide utility services for a proposed industrial park, but probably won't approve an aluminum plant at the site, a city official said.

About 70 people crowded into City Council chambers Wednesday for a public hearing on a \$100,000 community block grant to develop an industrial park south/east of town, adjacent to Three Island Crossing State Park.

The crowd listened to Ron Zior, a Boise developer representing Ronz Aluminum, talk about the aluminum recycling plant he hopes to build in the Glenns Ferry area. Preliminary talks about locating the plant at the planned industrial facility has drawn criticism from some local residents concerned about its effect on the state park and nearby winery, under construction.

Asked by Mayor Dayle Messery for a show of hands, no one opposed the plant locating somewhere in the Glenns Ferry area, but nearly everyone opposed it at the industrial site.

Messery said after the meeting the city intends to apply for the grant to develop the site but will approve that site for the aluminum plant only under dire circumstances, such as if the town's major

Cassel was arrested Wednesday night in Burley on charges of driving under the influence and no proof of insurance, Cassia County Sheriff's Sgt. Alan Smith said.

A person selling the ads arrived in the Burley area this week, Smith said. He would pick random numbers from the phone book and solicit advertisements for a community newspaper called "Child Watch," Smith said.

The man would say "Child Watch" reports on activities in the area and is distributed to schools and service organizations, Smith said. After collecting for the advertisement, the man would pocket the money, he said.

The man collected \$145 from a Jerome resident, Smith said, and had planned to collect from two Burley businesses today. The \$145 check, made payable to "Child Watch," was not cashed, Smith said.

Because the man didn't collect in Burley, he can't be charged in Cassia County, Smith said.

Arresting people for this type of fraud is difficult, Smith said, because they leave a town before residents realize they've been swindled.

In this case, however, "We've stopped what could be a pretty expensive crime to the public out there," he said.

Andrus defends wife's new role with Morrison-Knudsen

The governor maintained that his wife, Carol, is a private citizen and politicians' wives are entitled to the same opportunities as politicians' husbands.

"I see nothing wrong with it," Andrus said. "I see no conflict. The attorney general sees no conflict. Morrison-Knudsen's attorney sees no conflict."

Meanwhile Republican leaders are crying foul and accusing the media of failing to investigate.

Mrs. Andrus was named to the board of the Boise-based construction and engineering company earlier this year. The position carries a \$20,000 annual salary and \$1,000 a day compensation for each day

the board meets.

The governor said he and his wife have an agreement to keep their financial affairs separate "simply so they can't say Cece Andrus benefits from it."

Pointing out that Idaho is a community property state, House Majority Caucus Chairman Rep. Bruce Newcomb, R-Burley, said Mrs. Andrus' Morrison-Knudsen earnings do present a conflict of interest for the governor.

"The Republican Party feels most of the media is on Cece Andrus' side," Newcomb said during a separate interview. "Had he been a Republican governor who made this move, the press would have torn him

"They wanted (me) to knuckle under," he said. "I felt my number was at the top of their list."

After Thursday's hearing, in which he presented witnesses and a closing argument, Rosenheim said Moyle is the first in the area to contest INS fines for this type of violation.

Rosenheim argued that the Border Patrol had no justification for coming to Moyle's to audit the forms.

The Border Patrol agent who headed the investigation and audit had testified Wednesday that he began investigating Lee Moyle when an illegal alien, who worked at the Declo mink farm owned by Moyle's brother, was arrested.

Agent Scott Baker said he thought the Declo farm was owned by Lee Moyle.

Baker said he researched Lee Moyle's history with the Border Patrol, and decided to audit Moyle based on statements by Bruce Ellenberger, a former Cassia County jailer, that Moyle employed illegal aliens.

Ellenberger, who also is Don Moyle's father-in-law, denied those statements in court Thursday. His denial destroys the INS' justification of the audit, Rosenheim said.

Because agents shouldn't have collected the forms in the first place, Rosenheim said, they were seized illegally and their contents should not be used against Moyle.

Furthermore, Rosenheim argued, the Border Patrol agents acted improperly when actually seizing the forms.

Both Lee Moyle and his wife, Marta, testified that they didn't want the forms removed from their office when agents came for them last winter.

The "knew agents" were coming to inspect, they testified, but thought the agents would review the forms at the farm.

Marta Moyle testified that she protested agents taking the documents from the office. But when Baker presented a subpoena, she said she was intimidated and felt she had no right to object.

Baker testified Wednesday that the documents were turned over willingly.

The subpoena was used improperly, Rosenheim argued, because it was not served to Lee Moyle, to whom it was addressed.

Lee Moyle testified that he supports the immigration law and complies with it, although he doesn't personally check forms to verify residency.

Moyle said he pressed illegal aliens who worked for him when the law was passed in 1986 to apply for amnesty. Many continued to work while their applications were

Andrus said his wife has insisted on making an agreement with Morrison-Knudsen Chairman of the Board William Agce that she would not participate in any decision that could involve the corporation's work for the state. Morrison-Knudsen, which contributed \$2,000 to the Andrus re-election campaign last year, managed the construction of the new \$29 million maximum-security prison south of Boise.

Jess Hawley, Morrison-Knudsen's director of corporate communications, said Thursday the decision to name Mrs. Andrus

Flulike bug may strike Idahoans

TWIN FALLS - Idahoans who already have suffered through the Shanghai flu epidemic this winter, now face a new, influenzalike invasion, state officials say.

The new bug, called a para-influenza, mimics the symptoms of Shanghai A. But it is immune to vaccines, and it can be caught by people who already have had the flu, said Bob Medlin, state immunization coordinator.

The illness circulated through Utah in early-January and has been isolated in eastern and northern Idaho, as well as Boise.

Though no cases of the new illness have been identified locally, the bug probably is in the Magic Valley as well, said a local health official.

"It wouldn't surprise me if we have that going on here," said Cheryl Becker, an epidemiologist with the Public Health District V. "In fact, it would surprise me if we didn't have any cases."

Symptoms of the Shanghai flu last up to a week and include upper-respiratory infections, coughs, chills, aching muscles and fever.

The para-influenza adds nausea and diarrhea to the list and is accompanied by a lower-grade fever, but lasts only three to four days.

Becker said many people don't go to a doctor unless complications, such as pneumonia, set in.

"But for most people, when they're just a little uncomfortable, they won't go to the doctor," she said.

"Look-alike" diseases circulate every year during flu season, but this para-influenza is more severe than most, Medlin said.

It affects all age groups equally, while the Shanghai is more widespread among teenagers and adults than children, he said.

As for the Shanghai flu, Becker said she still has not seen enough cases to label it an "epidemic" in the Magic Valley.

Idaho is one of 18 states listed as epidemic flu states by the Centers for Disease Control. Some 44 cases have been reported statewide. The number is expected to begin declining in the next two or three weeks, Medlin said.

In 1988, up to 25 flu-related deaths were reported in Idaho, and the toll could be higher this year because of the epidemic.

Cash drain from budget slows down

BOISE (AP) - The drain of cash from Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus' Health and Welfare Department budget slowed on Thursday, but Republican budget writers were ready to renew their attack when environmental programs are considered.

After slashing some \$4.7 million from welfare programs on Wednesday, the GOP majority relented somewhat, although it did engineer a \$150,000 reduction in the governor's proposal for additional personnel in the Air Quality Bureau.



That action, cutting three new staff members to monitor air quality while retaining six new ones to write new air quality permits needed by business to begin operation, signaled the intentions on other programs to be taken up Friday.

Sen. Lynn Tominaga of Rupert was leading the new assault on the Andrus environmental budget, but he rejected Idaho Conservation League proposals to significantly trim the governor's recommendations, especially in the area of water quality, would not threaten the state's environmental quality program.

Tominaga said he wants to slow down the expansion of the Water Quality Bureau staff until lawmakers can determine exactly what level of personnel will give the state the most efficient operations.

Escaping the budget ax was more than \$622,000 for equipment needed by teams in the three regions of the state to handle any hazardous material accidents.

In the department's social programs, the panel narrowly continued its protective stance limiting competition for the state's 15 approved sheltered workshops, which serve handicapped and developmentally disabled people.

REXBURG — Ricks College's Rod Dixon scored on an alley-oop shot off a lobbed-inbound pass with 2 seconds left here Thursday to beat the College of Southern Idaho 87-86 and deny CSI the regular-season Region 18 men's basketball title and probably the No. 1 ranking in the nation.

Dixon's flying shot on the weak side away from a side-court pass stole the glory from CSI's Kyle Wilson, who pressured through two free throws with two seconds left for an 86-85 lead. But the clock didn't move again before the Eagles were dead.

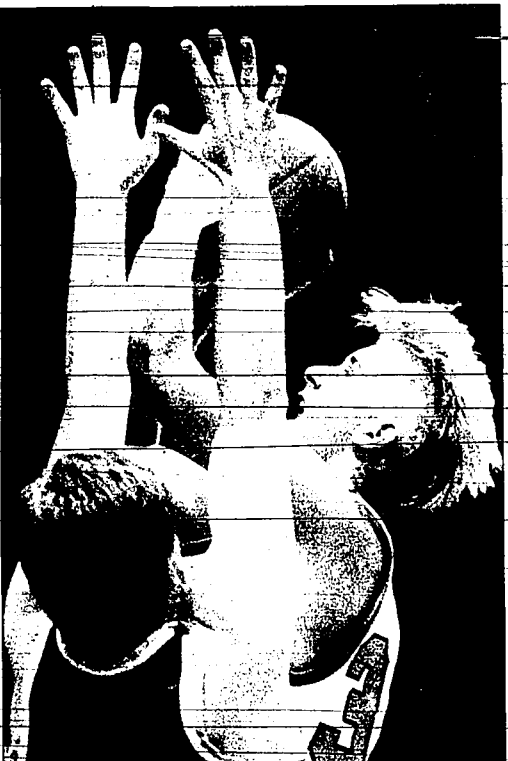

Sluggish Vandals rally past Northern Arizona, 64-52

FLAGSTAFF, Ariz. — The University of Idaho's basketball team awoke just in time to realize lowly Northern Arizona was on the verge of a stunning upset Thursday night at the Skydome.

The Vandals responded by opening up their biggest lead of the second half and then made eight-of-10 free throws in the final 11 minutes, 38 seconds to hold off the determined Lumberjacks, 64-52.

The victory assures the Vandals, 22-4 and 12-2, at least a share of the Big Sky Conference regular-season title. Idaho clinched the title outright by beating Nevada-Reno in Reno Saturday night.

The game was the debut for NAU coach Harold Merrill, who was named the head coach at the Flagstaff university Thursday morning. The former-head-coach of Morris Brown had served on an interim basis since the resignation of former NAU

coach Pat Rafferty January 24th.

Idaho coach Kermit Davis said the announcement may have given added incentive to the hosts.

"I think that team is about as emotionally high as they can be because of Harold being here," Davis said. "We didn't play very well and that is because of them. We are just happy to get out of here with a victory."


Both teams had trouble establishing themselves, offensively in the first half. Just when it looked like Idaho would begin to pull away, NAU would claw back into the contest.

The Vandals took a 12-7 lead at the 14-minute mark on a Riley Smith jumper, but NAU returned with a 6-0 run and led 13-12 with 10:55 remaining before intermission.

A running one-hander from Ron Shields, a Ricardo Boyd dunk and a pair of free throws from Smith, who had a game-high 19 points and 11 rebounds, gave Idaho a 25-16 lead with just over three minutes remaining in the half.

A sense of place: 'Out West' tells tales of Montana

"Out West: Stories from the Big Sky" is timely for two reasons.

First, the Montana Repertory Theatre's production is steeped in history, arriving in Idaho as the state celebrates its Centennial.

Second, the family-oriented musical celebrates what Jim Barruff, the show's director, calls "a reverence for the land" at a time when concern for the environment is on an upswing.

"Out West" will be presented twice next week, on Tuesday at Wood River High School in Hailey, and on Wednesday at the College of Southern Idaho's Fine Arts Auditorium in Twin Falls.

In a telephone interview this week from his office at the University of Montana in Missoula, Barruff said he found the inspiration for "Out West" in "The Last Best Place," a recently published anthology of Montana writers.

Barruff met with the book's editors, William Kittredge and Annick Smith, two prominent members of Missoula's blooming literary community. Receiving their support, Barruff blended material from the anthology with music.

The show began as a student workshop last fall. In November, Barruff auditioned people for the professional cast that is now in the midst of a six-state, 42-city tour that will run through early April. Montana Rep sometimes visits metropolitan areas, but its tours concentrate on smaller cities that have less access to theater.

Auditions were held in Seattle and New York City as well as in Missoula, and Barruff ended up gleaming half his

And three-and-a-half weeks of rehearsal in Missoula gave them ample time to become Western in their own right." Joining Hurley and Bennett in the show are Colleen Campbell, a University of Montana student from Chinoek, Mont., and Roger Mays, from Atlanta.

A lot of "Out West" deals with the myth and reality of the West. For example, at the end of the first act, the audi-

Boxcar Willie brings railroad music to Jackpot

JACKPOT - A hobo is not a bum. "He don't sit on a street corner and beg," says Boxcar Willie, who performs railroad songs and other country music in the image of a hobo. "He'll do a little work and he'll ride a freight train to get where he's going."

LeClair Martin always knew he wanted to be a country music star, but he didn't have a strong identity to separate him from the crowd. An idea for this identity came to him when he happened to see a ragged hobo who looked like Willie Wilson, an old Air Force buddy.

The singer recalls, "And I said, 'Hey, there's a house in a boxcar. Boxcar Willie.' The name fits so well because Boxcar, born in 1930, grew up in Texas during the Great Depression, a time that created hobos. His father was often gone, working for the railroad, and hobos would walk over from the nearby tracks to ask Mrs. Martin for work in exchange for a meal."

"They were colorful characters with stories about far away places," Boxcar recalled in a recent telephone interview.

To each other, they would spread news of the hobo jungle. When you get to that little town a hundred miles north of here, there's a house on the corner and the lady there is kind to hobos. ... But stay away from that house with the picket fence. They hate hobos. ... Gotta bad dog at this other place. ... They would sharpen my mother's knives and carry wood for her," Boxcar says. "They'd sweep the front porch and clean the yard, help her hang out clothes and do the wash on Mondays."

"Hobos are a very honest lot," he adds. "They'd die before they'd steal."

Boxcar drew attention when he sounded

off his imitation of a train whistle, the trademark that has helped make him famous. "My mother said I could do it when I was a little kid," he says.

After 22 years in the Air Force, Boxcar worked in Texas as a radio disc jockey and was the lead singer in a country band. His singing career had little success until he became a hobo character like the "Willie" in the boxcar and the ones he had admired in his youth.

Since 1975, the jovial hobo has made a name for himself touring the United States and has enjoyed an especially big popularity in Europe. In 1977, his album "Daddy Was a Railroad Man" was voted the British Album of the Year. In 1981, Boxcar joined the Grand Old Opry in Tennessee.

On stage, this man from a shack in Texas shuffles about in pin-striped overalls, red bandana, a worn suit coat, an old brown hat and tattered shoes, telling humorous stories and playing lively railroad songs. Behind him is an eight-piece show band, highlighted by honky-tonk piano, steel guitar and two national champion fiddle players.

Between shows, the entertainer says he likes to visit with fans and sign autographs.

When he isn't touring, Boxcar Willie and his family are working six days a week at their home in Missouri.

"We have our own theater in Branson, right in the heart of the Ozark Mountains," Boxcar says. "There are 21 country music theaters within a mile-and-a-half radius of one another. I don't need nightclubs. These are performing theaters, just like the Grand Old Opry. ... It's a big tourist area."

As he chats easily about his life, Boxcar laughs readily and says he really loves his audiences all over the world. And on a television advertisement to sell albums, he has a wide smile for every song. Is he really this happy?

"You better believe it," Boxcar says with another hearty laugh. "When you've got a great band behind you and you're singing the songs you love and the people are enjoying it, you get paid for doing it and you sell 60 million records in 10 years, hey, why shouldn't I smile?"

Boxcar Willie and the Texas Trainmen will appear at Cactus Pete's in Jackpot, tonight and Saturday. All shows are sold out, but a few tickets may be available at the door.

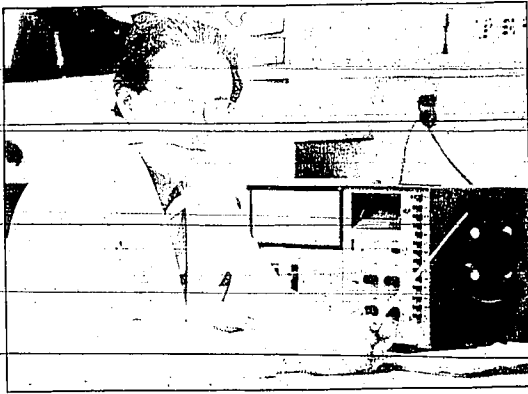

Byday, Buhidar, a bachelor at Stukenholz Laboratories in Twin Falls. Chemistry governs his life, he says, but it is music that brings meaning to that life.

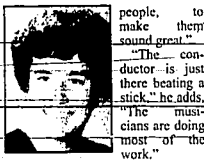
"It's a kind of Jekyll-and-Hyde existence at times, he admits, and it is sometimes difficult to balance the strict, black-and-white regimentation of chemistry with the romantic, intuitive nature of music."

Nevertheless, he plans to stay involved: both indefinitely. Music is a refuge, he says, noting, "I can get away and hide and vent all my frustrations." But there is a living to be made in chemistry.

Although this is his first involvement with the Magic Valley Symphony, Buhidar previously directed "Amahl and the Night Visitors," staged in 1988 by the Northwest Opera Association and the Twin Falls Music Club.

ence learns that it was Montanan Bob Fletcher, not Cole Porter, who wrote the beloved "Don't Fence Me In."

Fletcher sold the song to Porter in 1934 for \$250. He never received credit until the 1940s, and most people still think of Porter as the author.

The musical also examines the heritage and culture of Native Americans — how they dealt with issues ranging from missionaries trying to convert them to Christianity to the aftermath of the Battle of Little Big Horn.

And tied inextricably to the Native American's views, and those of all Westerners, is the expanse of the land. "Out West" looks at settlers who came west in search of a better life, only to find it was a lot tougher than they'd thought it would be.

Many hated the harsh life and returned east, Bartruff noted. But some stayed, mostly because they had learned to love the land. Others, such as Butte copper king Marcus

Daly — viewed the land strictly in terms of how much money could be wrought from it. "Out West" examines that viewpoint, too.

Although its main theme of love for the land is one that Bartruff believes transcends regions, "Out West" continues Montana Rep's commitment to producing theater that is uniquely Western.

Founded in 1967, the company originally performed classic American and European dramas such as "A Moon for the Misbegotten" and "A Servant of Two Masters," as well as contemporary Broadway hits like "Plaza Suite."

In 1985, the company decided to concentrate exclusively on shows by Western writers or productions about the West. Since that time, Montana Rep's productions have included "The Rainmaker" and "Cowboy," a musical about artist Charles M. Russell.

Bartruff said the company may eventually return to doing some productions originating outside the West, but never at the expense of its commitment to home-grown drama.

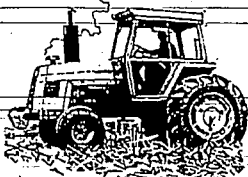

Musicians don't like warning labels

LOS ANGELES — Backstage at the Grammys, one of the biggest topics was the proposed legislation in several states to require warning labels on recordings deemed offensive.

"There's been a lot of negativity dredged up by many groups, from liberals to conservatives, about the record industry," said an agitated Don Henley. "There is a lot of finger-pointing going on and these people would be better off tending to parenting and stop wasting time beating up on rock 'n' roll."

"I'm tired of the music industry being singled out and picked on."

The Fresh Prince of nominated rap group DJ Jazzy Jeff & the Fresh Prince, said: "In America we have freedom of speech, and either we do or we don't. It's no gray area. (Public Enemy's) Chuck D, said, 'Fight the power,' and I fight the power with my mind."

But some of the artists addressing the issue were less forceful in their views. Said Paul McCartney: "I see both sides, as a parent with four kids, that puts me in a difficult position. Censorship is a dangerous thing, but I'm on the fence, unfortunately."

That comment illustrates the difficulty National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences president Mike Griggs has had in unifying the recording industry on the issue, which he views as a genuine threat. A bill requiring the labeling of potentially offensive records passed the Pennsylvania House of Representatives in December. Similar bills have been filed in four other states.

Greene characterized the record industry as being "in trouble" as he spoke backstage.

Grammy show goes briskly

NEW YORK — Once there were 28 categories of Grammy awards. Now there are 76. But unlike TV's Emmy Awards show, which has become an epic in itself, CBS' telecast of the Grammy awards moved along right smartly.

True, Wednesday night's 32nd annual Grammy Awards show from Los Angeles, aired live only on the East Coast, ran 37 minutes over its three-hour schedule. True, host Gary Shandling was a tad less than exuberant.

But you rarely had the feeling, as one often does on Emmy night, that every single winner would get to say thanks to everyone the winner knew, be it mother, agent, or third assistant cousin.

There was a whole lot of thankin' going on, make no mistake. The laconic jazz great, Miles Davis, did it in two short bursts, saying "Thank you," and, upon sighting a standing ovation for him, saying "Thank you again."

Two other winners were even moved to thank their lawyers.

But executive producer Pierre Cossette, who has been doing Grammy shows almost since the golden age of silent television, fashioned a

well-paced evening.

He gave a representative sampling of tunes and music forms; presenters who got to the point fast, and surprisingly few overly grateful winners.

The music world's annual salami to itself only really sagged when it spent about 20 minutes hailing the thoughts, words, music and video clips of Paul McCartney, whose name often is prefaced with the phrase "Former Beatle."

All this salute lacked was the intelligence that Fellow Former Beatle George Harrison had his tonsils taken out on Feb. 8, 1969.

McCartney proved a gracious visitor, though. He didn't even wince at the preliminaries, a solemn speech by Beatles' her Meryl Streep.

She or her speechwriter left the impression that he could make the lame walk and the tone-deaf hear, noting that his fine music not only had an impact on rock 'n' roll but "also on Western culture."

The McCartney hoopla was due to his Grammy-ignoring for a lifetime of musical achievement. Davis was

similarly honored, although late in the show, when it was in overtime. But he played his horn and sounded fine.

Wednesday's show, which among other things featured the first televised Grammy award for rap music, served as a reminder that rock no longer is for and by the young.

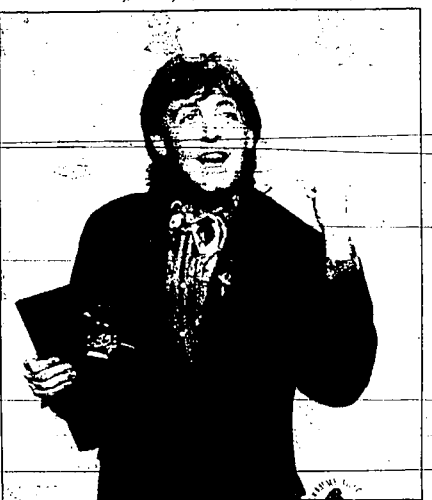
There were a few sprouts about or stage, notably the distinguished new rock group Milli Vanilli, which has one recent hit with lyrics that go "girl, you know it's true, ooo, ooo, ooo..."

But you also saw that rock 'n' roll is here to stay. There was McCartney, youthful-looking, but 47. And Grammy winner Bette Midler, only three years younger. And four-time winner Bonnie Raitt, 40.

We all get ancient. It's part of life's rich pagant. But you just don't think of rock stars getting ancient, too. The Grammy show, however, disproved this notion.

It left a distinct feeling that if someone ever makes a TV series about today's rock stars, it probably will be called "fortysomething."

'Stanley' doesn't ring true

HOLLYWOOD — What seems wrong with the tepid, well-intentioned 'Stanley & Iris'? Almost everything, unfortunately. The grand, Leonide director Martin Ritt and his writers, Harriet Frank Jr. and Irving Ravetch, are frequent collaborators and vintage liberals and, let loose on an impassioned subject, they can make a screen crackle with emotion. That is what they did with "Norma Rae," where the unionization of a Southern textile mill became the impassioned background to the story of a woman finding her real worth.

This time, they are telling a blue collar love story about two people thawing-out emotionally, with illiteracy as a sub-text. But in spite of individual lovely moments, the casting — particularly of Jane Fonda — and the screenplay give the picture a forced, bogus ring.

In a New England industrial town, we find Fonda as the recently widowed Iris King, straining to hold her family together. And though Fonda makes every effort at being "working-class folks, it is a stretch that fails. How can you hide the bearing, the bakery, the workouts? They don't help her blend into a bakery production lineup of untanned and somewhat doughy-looking co-workers. And when a purse snatcher grabs Fonda's bag and runs, instinctively you think, "Boy, is he gonna be sorry!" Every high-impact inch of Fonda telegraphs "Don't mess with me."

The man who comes to her aid is Robert De Niro's Stanley Cox, a loner working currently as a cook at Iris' bakery. He's something of a Thomas Edison when he tinkers

with inventions in his elderly father's garage and something of a misfit in the world because he cannot read.

De Niro is more of a chameleon than his co-star; he's made blue-collar roles fit him like autobiography — which they're not — but there is an odd glitch in the explanation of his illiteracy. Stanley is the son of Leonidis Cox (Feodor Chaliapin Jr., "Moonstruck's" memorable grandfather), an old-country emigre who, when his twins go to a state-of-age home, takes his cherished violin with him.

It's not impossible to believe that a youngster with a traveling-salesman father could sit in the back of 50 different schools, skinning by the teachers in every one. That's a shocking but entirely possible occurrence in America. But you cannot believe it about this specific son of this specific father. With his culture, his love of music, this old-world papa would have taught his son himself, every night in the hotel room. It simply doesn't seem thought-through.

Neither does the action, after the dire consequences when Stanley's secret is finally disclosed. Losing everything, as a last, desperate try he asks Iris to teach him to read. Through their nightly sessions in her kitchen, we are supposed to be warmed by their budding romance. The chemistry here is not memorable. Even granted her the mourning period, Stanley's like a friendly basket hound nuzzling a skittish thoroughbred. Old fashioned movie-star touches don't help. At night on a park bench, the smitten Stanley

says that Iris just stands out whenever he sees her. She ought to — that spotlight behind her hair makes enough light to work a crossword puzzle by.

Ritt, Ravetch and Frank are old hands at galvanizing audiences about specific evils, but 'Stanley & Iris' isn't exactly about illiteracy, a hydro-headed villain at best. It's really a fake drama that doesn't know which story it's telling. Is it the emotional trip back from widowhood? The gradual melding of two people who seem, initially, to be no more compatible than chalk and cheese? The saga of good old American know-how? Or the dilemma of teen-age pregnancy subplot involving Iris' high-school age daughter (Martha Plimpton). Actually, it is a little of each, with imagined-family-life dialogue. It is Iris saying, mock-cautionary to the pursuing Stanley, "We're a noisy family," when they're the quietest family in the world, the quietest and most unreal. Remember "Punchline"? That was family life, and each one of those daughters had a distinct identity. Iris' 11-year-old son is wallpaper that talks. Finally, why did the film makers think they needed this American Dream ending? Couldn't it be enough if Stanley was just a sweet, eccentric guy — who could read?

Well, there are some nice acting moments. Plimpton, who does teenage exasperation better than almost anyone, does it well again, and De Niro, who has some poignant moments with Chaliapin, tries to inject a little bantering charm to Stanley's scolding and sparking. Fonda has been most memorable working completely against expectation, playing "Klute's" hooker.

'Driving Miss Daisy' No. 1 at box office

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Fueled by a leading nine Academy Award nominations, "Driving Miss Daisy" put the pedal to the metal at the box office, collecting \$9.8 million over the holiday weekend, according to recently released figures.

The story of a Southern widow (Jessica Tandy) and her black chauffeur (Morgan Freeman) was nominated for best picture last Wednesday, and its two stars and supporting actor, Dan Aykroyd, received acting nominations. The film averaged \$7,040 per screen over the holiday weekend, Exhibitor Relations Co. said.

In second place was the Steven Seagal action movie "Hard to Kill," which grossed \$8.4 million and has made more than \$20 million in just two weeks of release. It was followed in third by the new Kevin Costner film "Revenge." The film, receiving mixed but most-

ly negative reviews, collected \$6.1 million. "Madhouse," a new film with John Larroquette and Kirstie Alley as a couple entertaining in a possible house guest, had ticket sales of \$5.2 million for fourth place.

"In fifth" was director Oliver Stone's, "Born on the Fourth of July," which snared eight Oscar nominations last week. It collected \$4.4 million.

"Nightbreed," a horror film from novelist Clive Barker, opened weakly in sixth place with a take of \$3.7

million and a lackluster per-screen average of \$2,493. In seventh was "Stella," Bette Midler's remake of the 1937 movie "Stella Dallas," with receipts of \$3 million. "Glory," the drama about all-black regiment fighting in the Civil War, finished in eighth on grosses of \$2.7 million. The animated hit "The Little Mermaid" landed in ninth with a gate of \$1.8 million.

Rounding out the Top 10 was the ensemble drama "Steel Magnolias" on a take of \$1.6 million.

'Fourth of July' ironic, explosive

BORN ON THE FOURTH OF JULY (R). No one can doubt director Oliver Stone's sincerity, any more than he can his talent for bravura emotionalism. Possibly because Stone emphasizes so enormously with his main character — co-writer Ron Kovic, who came back from Vietnam at age 21 paralyzed from the chest down — the director has lost the specificity that made "Platoon" so electrifying. His scenes, and their ironic juxtapositioning, explode like land mines. Tom Cruise delivers fierce physicality, empathy, the ability to work full throttle and a quality of defenselessness that is terribly touching.

Capsule reviews

Steven Spielberg's remake of the soppy 1943 Spence Tracy movie "A Guy Named Joe" might be "Forever," which is roughly its running time. All of us who fell under Holly Hunter's spell in "Broadcast News" and stuck to her through "Miss Firecracker" are in for a rough time of it. Cuteness turning overripe is not a pleasant sight. Richard Dreyfuss can do no better than his dialogue or his situation — or his direction, and all of that is, as they say, tooth-rotting.

DRIVING MISS DAISY (PG) Morgan Freeman gives an immensely gracious and subtle performance as an Atlanta chauffeur in this rather musty adaptation of Alfred Uhry's 1987 Pulitzer Prize-winning play. Jessica Tandy is the cranky widow. Their performances give the film a human gravity that helps counteract the too-measured pacing, its tone of

civic uplift. Directed by Bruce Beresford from Uhry's adaptation of his play.

HARD TO KILL (R). Another one against-a-hundred action movie and definitely not as much fun as an old Bruce Lee or Zatoichi. Martial arts whiz Steven Seagal, plunged into coma by the Mafia assassins of an Los Angeles assemblyman with senatorial ambitions, wakes up seven years later and begins a one-man rampage, aided only by Kelly Le Brock, herbs and acupuncture. Lethal here where most of his kill-fests are reactionary, the preposterous "Hard to Kill," directed by Bruce Malmuth, is otherwise notable only for the shortness of Le Brock's skirts and the length of Seagal's kicks.

STELLA (PG-13). Bette Midler indulges her unfortunate penchant for goey inspirational uplift in this ineffably bad updating of "Stella Dallas."

'Music Box' earns Golden Bear

WEST-BERLIN (AP) — The U.S. film "Music Box," starring Jessica Lange as an attorney who defends her father against charges of war crimes, won a Golden Bear award as the 40th-Berlin film festival came to a close.

The Golden Bear is the top award at the prestigious festival.

"Music Box," directed by Costa-Gavras, shared its Golden Bear with a 1969 Czech work titled "Stylarks on the String." The latter film, which criticizes the former communist state, was banned by authorities there for 20 years.

Another Golden Bear went as a special anniversary prize to American director Oliver Stone for his

film "Born on the Fourth of July," starring Tom Cruise as a paraplegic Vietnam War veteran who becomes a champion of the anti-war movement.

A short-animated film from Italy called "Misteria" won the third and final Golden Bear awarded this year.

The event, which ranks with the Cannes and Venice film festivals as the most important in the world, was held for the first time in East Berlin as well as West Berlin.

The 12-day festival brought a shower of famous stars down on the

city, including Lange, Stone, Sally Field, Daryl Hannah and Michael Douglas.

Other U.S. entries included "The War of the Roses" with Douglas and Kathleen Turner and "Shadow Makers," starring Paul Newman.

All together 22 feature films and 16 short works were in the running.

Seven Silver Bears were presented in various categories at the end of the festival. One went to American actor Morgan Freeman and actress Jessica Tandy for the best joint performance.

Julie Brown: Just say crazy

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Julie Brown wants you to know that her character on MTV's "Just Say Julie" is, to put it simply, sort of crazy.

"If you've seen her ditsy cartoon of an empty-headed Valley girl, you might agree. It's a persona she's honed with albums like "Goddess in Progress" and such songs and videos as "Homecoming Queen's Got a Gun," "I Like 'Em Big and Stupid" and "Trapped in the Body of a White Girl."

Brown's weekly half-hour show is a tongue-in-cheek way of introducing rock videos. It's set in her lacy condo, where friends and relatives occasionally drop by.

"I make fun of the videos," Brown said. "Some of them are pretty lame. After all, if it's rock 'n' roll, it should be a little rebellious. Poking fun at them is in the spirit of rock 'n' roll. MTV never told me to do that. They just said, 'Here's the show.'"

"You know, when television first started, Ernie Kovacs did a lot of experimental comedy," she said. "That was before the networks started research to see if their shows would appeal to people. I think research is killing a lot of good shows before they ever get on the air. It destroys innovation and originality."

Brown speaks from experience. Her pilot "Julie Brown: The Show" was broadcast by CBS last summer.

"But the research wasn't good enough to get it on the air. Then they came up with something called 'Peaceable Kingdom.' No wonder the networks are losing their audience to cable, because cable's still willing to experiment."

"Peaceable Kingdom" was an undistinguished drama on CBS' fall schedule that did a quick and merciful death.

Brown is in her second season on MTV. Of the cable music network's three female video jockeys, two are

named Julie Brown. The other is better known as "Downtown" Julie Brown. Don't think for a moment that Brown is like her character. She "did" grow up in the San Fernando Valley, the Valley Girl's natural habitat, but she studied acting at the prestigious American Conservatory Theatre in San Francisco. She's a comic and she writes her own offbeat songs.

She and her regular writing partner, Charlie Coffey — they wrote the "Earth Girls Are Easy" screenplay with Terence E. McNally — have several more movies in development. "Medusa: Portrait of a Pop Legend," in which Brown would play a pop music superstar, and "Totally Witchin'," a musical about a woman possessed by a witch's spirit.

Brown began doing a standup comedy act with Coffey while attending ACT in San Francisco. "Most female comics were taking sexuality out of their acts," she said. "I thought that was a shame. Marilyn Monroe could be sexy and funny at the same time. When I started 11 years ago, a lot of women were doing self-deprecating humor — 'I can't get a date.' I wasn't going to do that. I thought I was attractive."

"Charlie and I were very successful in San Francisco, but people in Los Angeles didn't understand our humor," she said. "Charlie left the act and I was doing a single. It's tough because you have to be aggressive with the audience. Then I began singing, and once I did that it became a whole new thing." Brown appeared in such movies as "Any Which Way You Can" and "Police Academy 2," and was a guest on such shows as "The Jeffersons," "Happy Days," "Laverne and Shirley" and "Newhart," where she appeared several times as airhead weather girl Buffy Denver. Before starting her half-hour show on MTV, she had made several guest appearances as a video jockey. In her early appearances, she came on and said she was "Downtown" Julie Brown, who is black. At the time, she was promoting her album "Trapped in a White Girl's Body." When MTV offered her a show, she said, she didn't want to move to New York. "I'm an actress, and I felt that would take me out of acting," she said. "We reached a solution and I do the show here. As long as I show three videos on each show, I can do anything I want. I can break into a video and say, 'Stop, I have something to say.'"

"It was an excellent slam," said South. "I took two key-cards off-side to go down."

South's analysis was good: a slam that depends upon success of one of two finesses offers overall favorable odds of 3-1. Even better is to find a way to improve one's chances when both finesses lose.

South played his slam like a man on horseback. He won his heart ace, quickly drew trumps and lost the diamond ace and lost a diamond finesse, sending the slam one down. The 3-1 morning-line favorite had stubbed his toes.

How could South have improved his chances? By guarding against losing to a doubleton diamond queen.

After winning his heart ace, South draws trumps, cashes dummy's heart king and ruffs a heart. Next he cashes his diamond ace and leads a low diamond, going up with dummy's king and refusing the finesse.

How can South afford to decline a 50 percent finesse in favor of a longshot doubleton queen? He has nothing to lose and much to gain. If East follows small, dummy continues with the jack. If East wins, South is no worse off than before — he must try the club finesse. If West wins, the diamond finesse would have worked, but so does this play. West cannot lead safely, and South is assured of his 12th winner.

Allen returns to small screen in story of the tragic Challenger flight's crew

By CONNIE PASSALACQUA

Karen Allen remembers when she was offered the role of schoolteacher-astronaut Christa McAuliffe in the docudrama "Challenger," airing Sunday, Feb. 25, on ABC. "I said, 'Ooh, I don't know if I want to do anything about something that happened so recently.' I had a lot of feelings that I think people will have when they hear about it... that this would be a movie that exploits the tragedy. But when I read (the script), it wasn't that at all. I thought it was very much a tribute to the seven astronauts who died."

On Jan. 28, 1986, the Challenger space shuttle, just launched at Cape Canaveral, Fla., shocked the world when it blew up. The television camera provided a cruel intimacy. Perhaps best exemplifying the spirit of this docudrama, that tragic moment is not the conclusion of "Challenger."

Instead, it ends at the moment of launch, showing the faces of seven hopeful, happy people who were finally beginning on a mission for which they had trained intensely, some for months, some for a lifetime.

"They didn't know what would happen. They didn't have any premonition," says Allen, who agrees with the upbeat ending as scripted by writer and producer George Englund. "To go through a three-hour journey and learn so much about the (astronauts') lives ... and have it end like that."

Allen says the tragic end often cast a pall over the making of the docudrama (which co-stars Barry Bostwick as Captain Dick Scobee and Peter Boyle as the only official who

recommended against the launch), "so we actors had to constantly let go of what we knew."

The story focuses on the astronauts' family lives during the previous six-months training period, plus the backstage decision-making processes at NASA that led to the tragedy.

It opens as New Hampshire social-studies teacher McAuliffe is chosen as the first teacher to ride — and teach a lesson by television — in space.

Allen's McAuliffe has a smile on her face throughout the docudrama. Judging from the research by Allen — using interviews, books, and actual training tapes furnished by a cooperative NASA — McAuliffe really was an upbeat person.

"That was hard to play," admits Allen. "I had to reach down to a younger, more innocent sensibility in myself. I wish I had more of that myself."

"But the more I saw Christa on tape ... with all that enthusiasm, no matter how world-weary or cynical you are, there was something about her that must have made being

around her positively infectious."

Though her film career includes "National Lampoon's Animal House" (1977), "Raiders of the Lost Ark" (1979) and Paul Newman's production of Tennessee Williams' "The Glass Menagerie" (1987), this is Allen's first TV appearance since a role in the miniseries "East of Eden" eight years ago. "I live in New York (with soap-actor-husband-Kale Browne, who plays the bit role of McAuliffe's husband Steven in "Challenger"), so I tend to get offered more film and theater rather than TV. Christa was a wonderful role, because she had so much charm and so much wit. She was so natural and self-assured for someone suddenly thrust into the limelight. She was chosen from 11,000 applicants and rose to that honor in every sense gloriously."

'Generations' still faces tough tasks

Was it only a year ago when NBC blew the trumpets about its new revolutionary project, the first half-hour black-and-white soap opera "Generations"?

Celebrating birthday No. 1 for the soap, a laggard in the ratings, NBC has little to brag about. Promoting was a breeze compared to the task of attracting a black audience as well as a white audience. Getting any soap formula down takes months, but pleasing two different audiences still has to be figured out.

"We're getting closer to what we started with," says writer Elizabeth Harrower. At age 71, she is the mother of Susan Seaforth Hayes, a guiding light at "Generations," a soap writer on all West Coast shows and an ABC consultant for the Eastern block.

While working for Bill Bell on "The Young and the Restless," Elizabeth was asked to read material written by secretary Susan Sussman. "She's young, but very talented. You would be foolish not to hire Susan," reported Harrower. Susan went on to win two Emmy nominations for "Y&R." After selling "Generations" to NBC, Susan called Elizabeth to work. So far the 10- and 12-hour workdays don't bother the senior citizen, who laughs telling stories about prime-time producers in their 30s who consider any writer over 45 dried up and out of touch.

It was Elizabeth who suggested the sickle-cell anemia story this fall and the racist reaction when the Marshalls bought into a white neighborhood. When the Marshalls enter a white church, some indignant whites walk out.

And guess where those Martin Luther King quotes came from a few weeks ago on King's birthday? Rewriting and editing, the lady is also having fun with a fast-moving moose head containing \$50 million.

"We had casting problems in the early stages, but those have been solved," Harrower explains, announcing the signing of Richard Roundtree and Debbi Morgan from "All My Children."

For the '90s, Elizabeth foresees a period of restraint replacing the rich

and ruthless era. Adventure in the afternoon is wearing thin, while stories on courage and spirit, making do on very little, resurface.

As for romance, hopping into bed just for fun now means risk taking. "We have AIDS to deal with," notes the writer, "and, so far we haven't done it properly." Tipping her hand on restraint, Harrower talks of a beautiful black virgin in storylines — a lady always being tempted, remaining pure until the church wedding. Talk about going to opposites in trends.

At this stage, picking the brain of Elizabeth Harrower is like having a library card. Push a button and you get an idea. "We all steal from film," says Elizabeth. "You see borrowed movie plots in all the daytime shows. All you have to do is look."

If Elizabeth ever runs dry, she can

borrow from her own life story. Adopted at 9 months after her mother's death, she was raised in Oakland, Calif., by a lady with a brothel background. "My father married everyone; my grandfather never married anyone," announces Elizabeth. She went to Miss Head's School in Berkeley for a while and finally graduated from high school at age 48. "I came to Hollywood at 18 and worked with Clark Gable, Spencer Tracy, Gregory Peck and John Wayne," Elizabeth continues.

"My first color film was 'Becky Sharp' at \$25 a day. I went out and bought a riding outfit, boots, whip and all and wore it everywhere. I even ran a boarding school for 25 years while acting. I was too busy living to write until my late 40s. Is there a book in me? I don't know."

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "The Cosby Show" made two appearances in the Top 10 Nielsen ratings released Tuesday, and "The Kennedys of Massachusetts" miniseries started strong but couldn't outpace "The Color Purple."

NBC won the ratings race for the week ended Feb. 18 with an average of 15.7, followed by ABC with 12.6 and CBS with 12.1, according to figures released by A.C. Nielsen Co.

A ratings point represents the percentage of the nation's 92.1 million television shows tuned into a show.

'Vremya' gives a peak at results of glasnost

NEW YORK (AP) — The anchorman doesn't look like Peter, Dan or Tom and doesn't use a TelePrompTer. He looks at the camera and says something in Russian. "Welcome, comrades," says the translator's voice-over. "Vremya," the Soviet evening news program, has come to U.S. public television. More than 100 Public Broadcasting Service stations from New York to Los Angeles are broadcasting "Vremya" in a two-week test begun Feb. 12 and coordinated by Boston's WGBH.

"Vremya"—it means "time" in Russian—has telegenic anchors, Marina Burtseva and Kira Grigoryeva, but lacks the pinball graphics and slick, electronic packaging of U.S. network news. Grigoryeva sits in front of the logo, Burtseva before a shelf of casually toppled videotape cases. They read from their scripts.

Glasnost is evident in its workmanlike Soviet-eye view of the upheavals of Soviet society in transition, such as the ethnic riots by "hooliganist thugs" in Tadjikistan and corruption in labor unions.

"It's like a broadcast you might

have found in the 1960s," said Steven Weinstock, producer of "The Eleventh Hour" late news show on the New York City PBS station, WNET. His station broadcasts "Vremya" at 1:30 a.m. While technically primitive, "Vremya" is straightforward in presenting the news, he said. "It lacks the entertainment values that have crept into U.S. news and it lacks the technical wizardry—and it's refreshing."

It also allows an American audience to see the most popular broadcast in the Soviet Union, to see what is driving Soviet public opinion, and get a good sense of what is going on," he said.

It has been estimated that 150 million Soviet people watch the 9 p.m. Moscow edition of "Vremya," which would make it the most popular TV broadcast in the world—if only the Soviets had A.C. Nielsen Co.

In the United States, nine of the nation's top 10 public TV stations are airing "Vremya," said WGBH news director Alan Foster. The underwriters are seeking underwriters for the show, which Foster estimates would cost \$1 million a year.

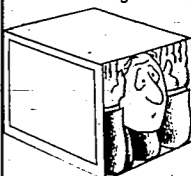
