Air cleanup accord won't fend off 'surgery' bid

WASHINGTON — Senate leaders and the Bush administration Thursday hailed a compromise clean-air proposal as a political breakthrough, but several senators of both parties lined up to amend the bill and environmentalists said it needs "major surgery." The agreement, coming after a month of secret negotiations, was described as stronger than President Bush's original bid to fight acid rain, urban smog and airborne toxic chemicals. But it was also described as weaker than the original Senate proposal. "It's a very big forward step," Bush said

while on a political trip to California. "I would encourage the Senate ... to move forward promptly, and then let's get it over to the House and do something to clean up the air in this country," he said. Bush, who had threatened to veto the Senate bill unless it were watered down to reduce its cost, said the compromise plan would accomplish that. "I'm not going to shut down this country, but I am going to help clean up the air," he said. "And that's exactly what this compromise results in."

Senate Majority Leader George Mitchell, D-Maine, said the plan "dramatically expands and strengthens the clean-air law and does it in the most cost-efficient manner possible." He said he did not have a cost estimate. But he said, "under this agreement, there will be significant improvement in the quality of the American air."

Environmentalists criticized the plan, saying it was better than the earlier version in the Senate. "This is no longer a clean-air bill; this is a hold your breath bill," said Daniel Becker, a lobbyist for the Sierra Club. "I think they've made some real progress," said William Fay, administrator of the Clean Air Working Group, the main business lobbying coalition on the bill. The compromise plan would address three areas:

using the high-sulfur coal mined in Midwestern states. However, Bill Roberts, the legislative director of the Environmental Defense Fund, said the plan could produce a smaller cut than 10 million tons because scrubbers would cost as 2 pounds. The plan also seeks political support from clean-air Western states by allowing them to increase sulfur dioxide emissions if more electricity is produced to meet growth.

California adding up quake costs

UPLAND, Calif. — Small cities counted the cost of broken windows and fallen bricks as dozens of aftershocks continued to rattle Southern California on Thursday, the day after a strong earthquake jolted the region. The town of Pomona alone suffered at least \$20 million in damage, officials said. Safety inspectors in Los Angeles and neighboring San Bernardino counties began checking gas and water lines and older, unreinforced brick and masonry buildings in communities that sprawl beneath the San Gabriel and San Bernardino mountains. Wednesday's 3:43 p.m. PST quake measured 5.5 on the Richter scale and was centered three miles northwest of Upland, 40 miles east of Los Angeles. It was the most serious tremor to hit California since October's magnitude-7.1 quake in the San Francisco Bay area, which left 67 people dead and sparked fears of the massive earthquake predicted for the state in coming years. Dozens of aftershocks continued to shake Southern California on Thursday, with the day's strongest, magnitude 3.0, at 12:55 p.m. PST.

Kaifu, Bush focus on trade

TOKYO — Prime Minister Toshiki Kaifu and President Bush began a hastily arranged summit today expected to focus on trade problems, but Japanese officials deny the sudden meeting indicates a crisis in relations. Bush invited Kaifu to meet in Palm Springs, Calif., in a surprise phone call Feb. 23. The trade talks in Japan apparently failed to make headway. Those negotiations are intended to change U.S. and Japanese lifestyles and business practices that affect trade and contribute to the United States' \$49 billion trade deficit. "Officials at the foreign and trade ministries said they interpreted Bush's sudden invitation as a sign of closeness between the two nations."

Idahoans may still have chance for abortion vote

BOISE — Despite public opinion polls indicating Idahoans want a say, a House committee suspended deliberations on abortion legislation Thursday without recommending a ballot referendum. But Idahoans may have the opportunity to vote on their opinions any way. On Monday afternoon, when the House is scheduled to begin debate on the Right to Life-sponsored bill, Rep. Ron Black, R-Twin Falls, plans to propose an amendment to the bill requiring an advisory vote on the November ballot. "What I've gotten from home is a number of people saying they're against abortion, but would like to vote," Black said. Right to Life proponents aren't happy about Black's plan. They think their bill, HB625, will pass the House. But they're worried about attempts to change a carefully crafted

Committee blocks 'abstinence' bill

BOISE — After a scathing review from teachers and school nurses at a hearing last week, the House Education Committee has effectively killed a bill mandating that local school districts emphasize abstinence in sex education courses. The panel voted 12-6 Thursday to hold the measure sponsored by Rep. Ivern Steger, R-Boise, and advocating "the only 100-percent effective protection against teen-age pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases and AIDS."

Some cholesterol tests not accurate

CHICAGO — Cholesterol tests were highly inaccurate up to one-tenth of the time, and some widely available portable testing machines had unacceptably high error rates even under ideal lab conditions, researchers said. Poorly trained operators and improperly set instruments were the primary culprits behind such misleading readings, which can cause people to seek unnecessary treatment or falsely reassure them they don't need it, the researchers said. Excess cholesterol in the blood is one of the three main modifiable traits that are linked with increased likelihood of heart disease, the nation's No. 1 killer. The others are high blood pressure and smoking. In a study in Friday's Journal of the American Medical Association, all screening results were within an acceptable range of accuracy in only one of four public cholesterol testing programs. In screenings carried out by three cholesterol testing companies, significant numbers of values strayed from true levels by more than 14.2 percent, the largest range of error allowed under

guidelines of the National Cholesterol Education Program, researchers said. The highest rate of unacceptable results was 33.5 percent, among screenings by a company at an unidentified work site, said researchers at the University of Minnesota School of Public Health. Screenings by other companies, at a grocery store and at a retail store, yielded unacceptable results of 9 percent and 7.6 percent of the time, the researchers found. Screenings for only one group, performed at the Minnesota State Fair, were within the acceptable range of error 100 percent of the time, the study found. The true values were established on samples from the same subjects measured in a nationally standardized laboratory using ultra-modern equipment, the researchers said. The companies that did the best were the ones where their staff had undergone quite a bit of training, said Michelle J. Neughton, a sociologist and lead author of the study. "The individuals whose screening was most accurate had received only one day of training and no apprenticeship or refresher courses,"

At the Minnesota State Fair, where accuracy was highest, testers had undergone four days of training, an apprenticeship and three-hour refresher courses every three months, the researchers said. In a separate study in the journal, Massachusetts researchers tested portable analyzers under ideal lab conditions with professional operators who had been trained by the manufacturers. They found three brands of machines had error rates higher than allowed by the federal guidelines. The two worst analyzers, the Analyst made by Du Pont Inc. and the Seralyzer made by Miles Laboratories Inc., were outside the range of acceptable error about one-fourth of the time, researchers said. The acceptable range of error in this study was 5 percentage points. Another analyzer, the Reflotron made by Boehringer-Mannheim Diagnostics Inc., was outside the range 15 percent of the time, said the researchers, led by Dr. Harvey W. Kaufman, formerly of the Framingham Union Hospital and now of the University Hospital in Boston.

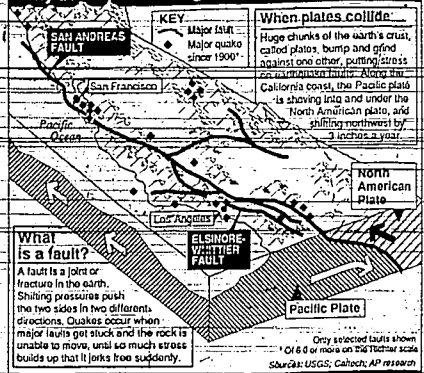
Sandinista military suffering desertions

Ortega was defeated in Sunday's election by Violeta Chammorro, who has promised to abolish the draft after she is inaugurated on April 25. Some deserters are apparently planning to hide out until that happens. Continued from Page A1. "We just had a nice little after-shock," Claremont Assistant City Manager Bridget Distefano said. "We just got hit again. They're very short, they don't last long enough to get under a table." Immediately after Wednesday's jolt, there was a 3 percent chance of a larger quake within three days, based on historical statistics, said geologist Leticia Gonzalez of the Geological Survey in Pasadena. But she said that by Thursday, the probability had dropped to 2 percent, or 3 percent. Injuries from the quake, reported to be minor, cuts, bruises and a few broken bones, were the chief complaints, officials said. State Office of Emergency Services official said it is doubtful that Upland, La Verne, Pomona and Claremont were most affected, with Pomona and Claremont each declaring emergencies. La Verne City Council members on Thursday afternoon decided to withdraw an emergency declaration issued the day before. They feared damage was likely to range only

between \$500,000 and \$750,000, said Mayor Pro Tem Thomas R. Harvey. "Things are much better than we ever expected," Harvey said, adding 62 buildings in La Verne were reported damaged. Pomona Mayor Donna Smith made a preliminary damage estimate of \$20 million, said city fire department Inspector Ron Gomez. Pomona City Hall was broken glass everywhere, he said, but not replaced. The city of 113,000 is the largest in the immediate vicinity of the epicenter. There were 120 structures damaged throughout the city, including the historic Phillips Mansion built in 1875 that was the home of one of the area's founding families, said Smith. A chimney on the mansion crumbled and crashed through the roof. Also in Pomona, brick and concrete trimming from a wall of the chapel of the Trinity United Methodist Church tumbled through a roof and into an unoccupied Sunday school nursery below.

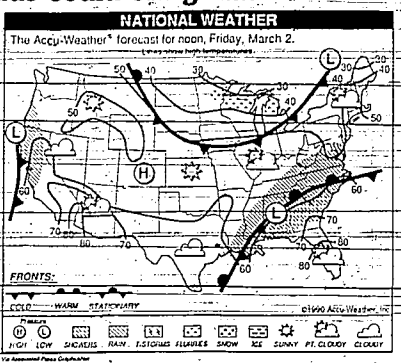

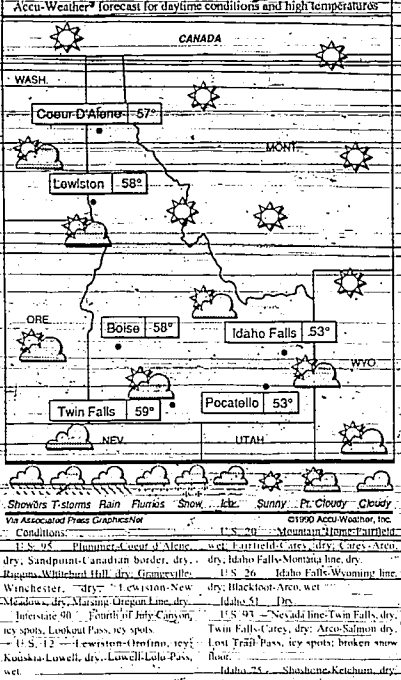

Continued from Page A1. causing emissions of hydrocarbons by 22 percent and emissions of nitrogen oxides by 60 percent. But the plan could avoid a second round of tailpipe restrictions originally proposed by the Senate. The second round of emissions restrictions, cutting carbon monoxide by 50 percent and cutting the other two pollutants another 50 percent in late 2003, would be ordered only if 11 seriously polluted cities continued to have unhealthful levels of smog.

AIRBORNE TOXIC CHEMICALS
The plan would regulate the emission of 191 toxic chemicals from factories and other facilities. The government has regulated only seven such chemicals in the past 20 years. Like the original Senate plan, the compromise would order factories to install state-of-the-art technology to control those emissions. But a second round of cuts, tied to a one-in-a-million risk of cancer, could be changed by Congress. Following studies by the National Academy of Sciences and a blue-ribbon commission. Also, the proposal on toxic chemicals for the first time would allow some businesses to have nearby homes and higher residents if they continue to face cancer risks. Mitchell said he hoped the agreement would win enough support to forestall the threat of a filibuster. He would need 60 votes to end a filibuster. He said the Senate would start debating the compromise bill Monday.

While Mitchell, Senate Minority Leader Robert Dole, R-Kan., and White House officials said they would oppose amendments to the key provisions, Dole said as many as 100 amendments could be introduced during the debate. Even some of the senators who appeared with Mitchell Thursday said they would push for changes. Environmentalists said they would like to support amendments to strengthen the bill. Richard Ayres, chairman of the National Clean Air Coalition, said the "backroom dealing has generated bad deals for the American people." David Gaffner, legislative director of the Sierra Club, said the change of avoiding the second phase of auto emission controls would deny millions of Americans technologically feasible, affordable auto controls based on a determination that not enough Americans are suffering.

Continued from Page A1. Besides promoting abstinence as the "expected norm," the bill would have barred sex education classes during a "latency period" for children 5 through 12, when they are sexually immature and educational/ideal.
Steger said the idea was to ensure sex education material presented in the schools is "age appropriate."
"For fifth graders to learn how to put a condom on a banana is not age appropriate," he said.
Rep. W. O. "Bill" Taylor, R-Nampa, agreed that the measure was aimed at "promoting morality," but opponents said it ignored the reality of today's teenagers.
"I don't think there's a lot of morality in promoting insurance," said Rep. Cimo White, D-Cataldo. Steger's bill also would have outlawed "school-based health centers or services, including a ban on dispensing personal advertising, dispensing contraceptives, birth control devices or information."
But Rep. Mary Ellen Lloyd, D-Pocatello, said teens often need that kind of information to avoid some of the pitfalls of adolescence, and schools should be able to provide it.
"It's sad to say, but we have sexually active kids," she said. "I think we need to reach these kids."
Last week, the majority of people who testified at a public hearing before the Education Committee agreed that Steger's bill would be "one very giant leap backward" in sex education.

Continued from Page A1. The Idaho Legislature should not set any guidelines on abortion. Black had wanted to keep his amendment secret until Monday's floor debate, but House Education Committee Chairman Rep. Bruce Bengson, R-Boise, revealed his plans Thursday after explaining why she'll wait on her own ballot referendum proposals until the House has voted on the Right to Life bill.
After presiding over more than 20 hours of public hearings, where the Right to Life proponents outnumbered the pro-choice activists at least 2 to 1, Bengson said he thought the bill should have a fair hearing in the House.
Right to Life did a good job following the system, she said. "They were well organized," but Bengson said she finds it "personally distasteful" for Idaho to be used as a test case for abortion restrictions.
Bengson said she is contemplating offering another abortion bill allowing abortion through the first 20 weeks of pregnancy.
The July decision in Webster vs. Reproductive Health Services effectively authorized states to increase restrictions on abortion after the first 20 weeks of pregnancy. The court's majority upheld Missouri's law citing that as the point of "fetal viability." "It just seems to me we can pass laws that the Supreme Court has already told us we can't do, but we haven't done that," she said.
On Thursday, Bengson's committee also filed a bill from Sen. Karl Brooks, D-Boise, that would allow abortions up until the point of fetal viability as determined by a woman in consultation with her doctor. Rep. Bruce Newcomb, R-Burley; Rep. Tom Morrison, R-Jerome; and Rep. Ralph Peters, B-Jerome joined the majority voting to hold the bill. Morrison, who just became a member of State Affairs this year, said he was glad the committee's abortion deliberations are finally over — at least for now. He favors a proposal by Rep. Gary Robbins, D-Twin Falls, to repeal Idaho's abortion trigger law, which sets criminal penalties for women undergoing abortions as well as the persons performing the procedure. That bill also will come up for a full House vote next week. "I think all of this is premature," Morrison said. "I think it would have been better off for us to follow the Supreme Court's lead."

Nuclear plant given license to open

ROCKVILLE, Md. (AP) — The Seabrook, N.H., nuclear power plant won federal permission Thursday to produce commercial electricity after two decades of protests and legal struggles that made it a symbol of the national anti-nuclear movement.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission voted 3-0 to grant a license for Seabrook to operate at full power but delayed issuing it for two weeks to allow an expected appeal in federal court.

Two of the commission's five members abstained from the vote because of involvement in Seabrook issues prior to becoming commissioners.

Opponents have long maintained that people near the plant would be trapped in a nuclear emergency, and officials in Massachusetts, with a border just two miles from Seabrook, said they would indeed take the case to U.S. District Court in Washington.

Bush lifts sanctions against Panama

LOS ANGELES (AP) — President Bush on Thursday lifted the last sanctions against Panama, imposed for its failure to cooperate in drug-fighting efforts, and their "ouster a maximum-security prison, saying "tough talk is simply not enough" in battling crime and narcotics.

Bush, in a day-long series of appearances in Los Angeles, also held a fund-raising luncheon with Republican governors and was to address the California Chamber of Commerce at dinner.

Today, Bush will fly to Palm Springs for a two-day summit with Japanese Prime Minister Toshiki Kaifu to try to repair relations strained by trade tensions.

Most of the economic sanctions against Panama were removed in December following the U.S. invasion and the toppling of Manuel Antonio Noriega, who now awaits trial in Florida on federal drug trafficking charges.

\$78 million available for housing use

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government opened the competition Thursday for nearly \$80 million that savings and loans and other financial institutions will be able to use to offer cut-rate loans to promote affordable housing.

Under the program, included in last year's legislation to bail out the S&L industry, the \$78.7 million will be used to buy down the interest rates on certain housing loans, making the financing affordable to those whose incomes otherwise would be insufficient to make monthly payments.

Housing and Urban Development Secretary Jack Kemp, who announced opening of the bids in his capacity as chairman of the Federal Housing Finance Board, said the loans could add 20,000 units to the nation's stock of low- and moderate-income housing.

Cheney agrees with Bush troop cuts

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Defense Department may "shrink by several hundred thousand employees in the next three or four years as a result of budget cuts and arms control treaties," Defense Secretary Dick Cheney said Thursday.

Cheney, testifying before the House Foreign Affairs Committee, provided an overview of Defense Department policies in a wide-ranging session with lawmakers.

Cheney stood by the Bush administration's plan to cut troop levels in Europe, allowing 125,000 U.S. troops in the European Central Zone and 30,000 troops elsewhere in Europe. The troop plan was dropped out by Secretary of State James A. Baker III and Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard Shevardnadze in Ottawa, Canada, last week.

Senate Majority Leader George Mitchell, D-Maine, on Thursday joined Sen. Sam Nunn, D-Ga., in criticizing the plan for failing to give the United States enough flexibility. Air Force Secretary Donald Rice has also questioned the plan.

Bush could support less aid to Israel

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Bush administration could support cutting U.S. aid to Israel and Egypt if similar cuts were applied to other nations as a way of freeing money for emerging democracies, Secretary of State James A. Baker III said Thursday.

Baker told a House subcommittee that "we're willing to stand up and be counted" on such a plan because it would result in the flexibility to put foreign aid money where it is most needed.

In answer to a question by Rep. David Obey, D-Wis., chairman of the House Appropriations subcommittee on foreign operations, Baker said administration support for the cuts would "depend on whether we do it in a non-discriminatory manner."

In recent travels in the Middle East, Baker said he has not found any significant reduction in tensions. But he added: "At the same time, we must find a way to respond to changes in Eastern Europe, in Panama and in Nicaragua."

U.S., U.S.S.R. to issue 4 new stamps

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States and the Soviet Union will jointly issue four new postage stamps this fall, the U.S. Postal Service announced Thursday.

The stamps, two designed by an American government artist and two by a Soviet counterpart, will feature creatures of the sea. First-issue ceremonies will be Oct. 3 in Baltimore, Md., and Moscow.

Peter Coe of the U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing is designing dolphin and killer-whale stamps.

CIA director says Soviet threat unlikely

WASHINGTON — The tide of democracy sweeping the Soviet Union and its allies is "probably already irreversible," and even if hardliners ousted Mikhail Gorbachev, a ousted Soviet military would be unlikely, the head of the CIA told Congress Thursday.

William H. Webster, in a rare appearance on Capitol Hill, undermined the Pentagon's argument that U.S. military spending must remain high to assure the United States can deal with any military threat posed by a Soviet Union that reverts to its pre-glasnost role as the "East Empire."

"Even if a hard-line regime were able to retain power in Moscow, it would have little incentive to engage in major confrontations with the United States," Webster told the House Armed Services Committee. "New leaders would be largely

preoccupied with the country's urgent domestic problems, and would be unlikely to indulge in a major military buildup."

"It's almost as if you're saying we're in a win-win situation," said committee Chair-man Les Aspin, D-Wis.

Congressional aides said Webster's testimony will fuel legislative efforts to cut next year's defense budget.

Before heading behind closed doors to answer members' questions, Webster portrayed the rush toward democracy in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe as a snowball gathering speed and size with each passing second.

As these upheavals continue to gain momentum, they will be progressively more difficult to suppress," he said of the changes.

Drawing on "his intelligence generally and assessment of current conditions and projected trends in the Soviet Union, Webster said there is "little chance" that the Soviets could regain control of their European allies. The communism that once bound them together "is now bankrupt as a serious alternative to democratic pluralism," he said.

"Communist parties and Marxist doctrines are collapsing or already lie in ruins," Webster said, adding that communism will continue to thrive only in "a small number of backward, isolated nations."

Pentagon officials, as justification for a 1991 military budget request of \$295 billion, have repeatedly cited the possibility that the Soviet Union could reverse its march toward democracy.

"There is enormous uncertainty about the likely political developments in the Soviet Union in

Andrus' actions reminiscent of former congressman Hansen

As Gov. Cecil Andrus prepares to extend his reign into an unprecedented fourth term, he emphatically says there is no "good-politician" in his administration.

But recent events suggest just the opposite, and Republican opponents finally have hard evidence that Andrus has built an imperial governorship.

Andrus' arrogance of power was demonstrated in two cases last week.

First, he told an old friend and party pal to retire.

Armed with a sheaf of memos, Andrus told the Capitol press corps that Mel Morgan, the state's highway safety administrator, screwed up when he arranged to get sick pay for suspended Transportation Director Kermit Kiebert.

"The good-old-boy network doesn't take place in this state," Andrus crowed self-

righteously.

But Kiebert, have you forgotten who got Mel his job?

"He was the guy who insisted he be hired," says Transportation Board Member Phil Batt, who is considering a race against Andrus.

Morgan was Democratic party chairman in 1988 when Kiebert, with Andrus' essential backing, put him in the \$41,870 job.

In a stinging letter to Kiebert, then Transportation Board Chairman John Olman, blasted the appointment.

"My impression," Democrat Olman wrote on April 7, 1988, "is that the hiring of Mr. Morgan by you represents nothing more

than an act of political patronage, as a courtesy, and accommodation for political figures, without concern for the morale of other employees, the appearance to the public, possible repercussions by the Legislature, and . . . the desires of the Board."

But Andrus intervened and Morgan got the job. Now that he's done something embarrassing - which was brought to Andrus' attention by Batt . . . the governor acts as if he never met his Morgan fellow.

"I've known him for 20 years," said Morgan, vowing to fight for his job. "I always thought we were friends."

Morgan insists he was following orders from Transportation Board Chairman Marion Davidson. Andrus, moving swiftly to cut his losses, acted before talking to Davidson.

The second case has high-level Democrats scratching their heads.

Andrus' wife, Carol, took a spot on the board of directors of Morrison Knudsen Corp., an engineering and construction firm that does millions in state business.

Privately, Democratic leaders say they were stunned, especially in an election year.

Andrus himself must have misgivings. A supremely confident man who rarely breaks a sweat, he was perspiring Thursday when reporters grilled him about his wife.

He insisted there was no impropriety or conflict of interest.

Andrus said Carol's income from MK about \$28,000 a year plus benefits - is "fully segregated" from the rest of the household income.

The last time we heard that was when former U.S. Rep. George Hansen explained

away ethics violations.

Incredibly, Andrus claimed to be unfamiliar with Hansen's tack.

This response demonstrates an insensitivity to the ethics question: "Basically, the amount of money that she gets from that is not a significant income compared to my salary or my total income."

There's some evidence Andrus has done anything the least bit illegal, and he's not subject to the same rules as Hansen, who was convicted and jailed.

But Andrus displays an arrogance reminiscent of George.

One of the basic lifebloods of Magic Valley is its topsoil.

Where is the concern for the loss of this important basic resource? Without soil, there is no need to worry about power plants or crop burning of any kind.

In the Magic Valley when the vegetation dies, the tradition is to burn.

This begins in March or before and continues until it snows.

There isn't much concern, about smoke here and there that isn't much. The wind will clear the air - give it a few minutes.

One way to keep the soil from blowing away is to plant houses on it - a favorite pastime in the Magic Valley.

Another way to hold soil down is to over water - the fine soil is washed away, at least it doesn't blow away.

If we don't protect the soil, Magic Valley has no future. Overall soil production is declining from the loss of topsoil.

To make up for the loss, more fertilizer is applied. The chemical companies love it, but our water quality is adversely affected.

Lost soil and polluted water equals unpaid bills and hungry people. Think about it - everybody suffers.

Unlike the isolated odor of commercial incense, the smoke from thousands of burning acres will affect everyone regardless of where we live.

Advocating the economic benefits of lawn seed production is a death wish to our valley's crisp, clean, clear, autumn air quality.

The horrendous impact of orchestrated grass field burning is in no way comparable to our previous tolerance of intermittent ditch-bank or grain-stubble burns.

Not only will windows be closed but

future population growth and clean industry will become discouraged.

Our fall tourists will soon spread the word to compare our air quality to Los Angeles smog.

For anyone to dismiss the potential for such an adverse aesthetic impact upon all of us for the sake of economic demand is ludicrous in their responsibility to preserve our quality of life.

The lawn seed industry - like the dairy industry - has been pressured to relocate because of their adverse impact upon surrounding property values.

Lowest cost confinement can be zoned away from residential development, or vice versa; however, burning field smoke is no more controllable than the wind.

Many people may think that the State or local government will be able to abate excessive aesthetic nuisances should it become necessary.

Such naive assumptions are ridiculous and one has only to visit Richfield or Pocatello for an illustrative example.

The beneficiaries of the lawn seed enterprise are attempting to convince the communities that this is our kind of industry because the Magic Valley climate is more conducive to burning than the dry lands of northern Idaho.

When a population impact study, they profess our area as being a better place to burn.

Idaho, unlike Washington and Oregon, does not regulate field burning. Each summer, approximately 16,000 acres of grass fields are burned in northern Idaho, and every year, hundreds of smoke complaints fall upon the deaf ears of regulatory agencies.

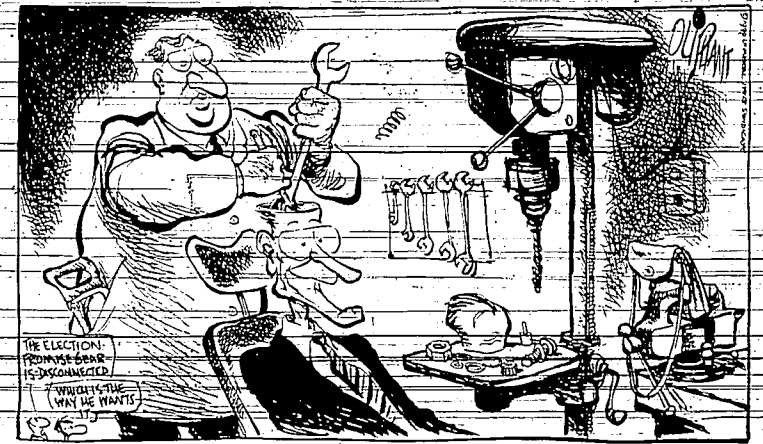
The most obvious limiting factor to northern seed crop production is burn-off efficiency - certainly not residential impact, available land or irrigation.

There is an exceptional demand for lawn grass seed, and the current developer could establish our valley as a grass farm capital just with an opening bid for the indiscriminate burning of a minimum of 20,000 acres.

Those in the Magic Valley residents, another or choke in their apathy of a silent majority, please visit the northern Idaho burn-off season or take a drive through Jerome's southwest dories to get a visual understanding of how the absence of agricultural planning can adversely impact everyone's quality of life.

Our Magic Valley is not a better place to burn!

GOP leaders take stock of future

While President Bush backed in his latest stroke of good fortune - the defeat of Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega - several architects of the Republican resurgence of recent years met Monday to discuss the GOP's long-term prospects.

Considering the president's soaring popularity and continuing Democratic disarray, the mood was surprisingly sober at the panel sponsored by the Progressive Policy Institute created by moderate Democrats to stimulate serious political discussion.

"The one thing that has been clear over a long period of time in politics in this country is that you can't tell what is going to develop," noted David Keene, who heads the American Conservative Union.

Several participants predicted difficulties in the 1990s for the coalition that produced landslide victories for Ronald Reagan and Bush. Others saw nothing but bright days ahead for the GOP.

Texas pollster Lance Parrance and former U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Jeanne Kirkpatrick were optimistic.

Parrance noted that the GOP national resurgence of the past quarter-century was fueled by the influx of three main groups:

white Southern males in 1964 and 1968, Catholics in 1972 and 1976, and people under age 30 in 1980 and 1984. Now, he noted, these groups are increasingly identifying themselves as Republican.

Kirkpatrick, a longtime Democrat whose transition to the GOP began when the Democrats nominated George McGovern in 1972, attributed the sea change in American politics to the emergence of the "counterforce" as a political force at the 1968 Democratic Convention in Chicago. But veteran analyst Kevin Phillips, conservative activist Paul Wesley and

media consultant Doug Bailey all saw threats to the Republican coalition.

"I think there's a lot of vulnerability in the coalition at this point," said Phillips, who developed the theory of GOP "Sun Belt" dominance.

"By historical standards, he said, majority coalitions last about as long as the GOP domination that will reach 24 years in 1992. He said abortion threatens to divide the GOP's rank and file from its leadership, while its economic policies have helped the rich at the expense of many who backed Reagan."

Ukrainians press resignation demand

MOSEW (AP) — A workers' committee in the Ukrainian coal-mining city of Donetsk called a six-hour strike Thursday to press demands that the entire local Communist Party leadership resign. Nikolai Volynko, committee co-chairman, said the group called on Donetsk shift personnel to stay home from the city's mine in a warning strike. If the party officials do not quit as a result, Volynko said, the committee will call on miners throughout the region to walk off the job Friday.

Mexico aids Sandinistas in election

WASHINGTON (AP) — Mexico offered upwards of \$11 million in covert assistance to the campaign of Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega for above the acknowledged U.S. donations to the victorious opposition coalition, U.S. officials said Thursday. When asked by U.S. officials about the alleged contribution, Mexican officials acknowledged that donations had been made but that the American figure was highly exaggerated, the sources said. Under the laws governing last Sunday's Nicaraguan election, foreign contributions were required to have been reported to the Supreme Electoral Council. Half of the cash contributions were to have been shared with the council.

Israeli prime minister hardens stance

JERUSALEM (AP) — Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir, under pressure from Likud bloc hawks, on Thursday hardened his stance on U.S. proposals for convening peace talks with a Palestinian delegation. In an interview with The Associated Press, Shamir ruled out participation of Arabs from East Jerusalem in the process and said there was no need for two exiled Palestinians in a proposed 10-member negotiating team.

E. Germans moving to privatization

EAST BERLIN (AP) — East Germany took the first step Thursday toward privatizing state industries but set conditions that prevent a wholesale sale of major assets, apparently to prevent a buyout by West Germans. Also Thursday, the Foreign Ministry called on West Germany to start talks to coordinate a common German position to present at the "two-plus-four" conference later this year to steer a course for unification.

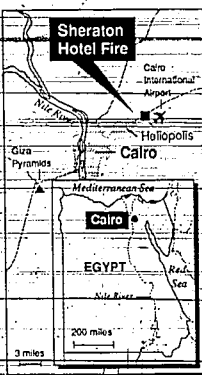
22 missing as Korean boat capsizes

TOKYO (AP) — A South Korean fishing boat capsized in the South China Sea early Friday, and 22 crew members were missing, Japan's Maritime Safety Agency reported. The 100-ton Hanah sank about 200 miles west-northwest of Okinawa, Japan's southernmost island prefecture, said Hajime Awano of the agency's Okinawa station.

Ethiopia asks help to fight off famine

ADDIS ABABA (Ethiopia AP) — Ethiopia appealed Thursday for 14 cargo planes and nearly 600 trucks to haul food to famine victims in its northern provinces. Yilmara Kassaye, the relief and rehabilitation commissioner, estimated the cost of the airlift and trucking operation at \$14 million a month, above the cost of the food. The United Nations estimates that 1.1 million tons of food will be required to feed 4 million drought victims in danger of starving in the northern provinces of Eritrea, Tigre, Wollo and Gondar in the next six months.

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — Fire broke out in a luxury hotel's tent restaurant early Thursday and wind-whipped flames leaped to the main building, killing 16 people and injuring about 70. At least one American was among the dead. Tourist Minister Fouad Sultana said the three-spined tent, which was built in 1987, was a cotton canvas tent attached to one of the three blocks of the T-shaped hotel. The head of Cairo's fire brigade, Major Gen. Adel Nazzari, said such tents are fire hazards and the Sheraton put it up without consulting the fire department. Sparks jumped from a clay oven to the ceiling of the tent, igniting flames that quickly spread to the hotel, said Sultana. Cairo chief Mahmud Sherif told the official Middle East News Agency the use of such tents at hotels would be reviewed. A fire broke out in a similar tent at Nile-side Gezira Sheraton about a year ago but was quickly extinguished with no casualties. The Helopolis Sheraton, about 10 years old, is the only one of Egypt's six Sheratons without an alarm system or sprinklers. Sultana said they are not mandatory under Egyptian law, but most first-class hotels began installing them in 1987. Winds of nearly 25 mph fed the flames, which destroyed about 60 of the 630-room hotel, including its restaurant and elaborate lobby, where live birds flew among tropical plants and fountains. Later in the day, people crowded around the still-standing front desk, asking for passports and belongings. There were about 1,000 guests and 300 employees in the hotel at the time of the fire. It was not known how many people were inside the Nubian Tent, where belly dancing and other entertainment is featured. Interior Ministry spokesman Maj. Gen. Pasha el-Din Ibrahim said the 16 dead included eight French nationals and two Finns.

Lithuania vote may be March

MOSEW (AP) — Lithuanians are speeding up election of their new parliament so it can vote for independence before March 12, when Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev is expected to get what one activist on Thursday called "dictatorial powers."

In the neighboring Baltic republic of Latvia, the parliament Thursday chose a collision course with Moscow when it gave voters the right to refuse conscription in the Soviet army.

And in Moldavia, another of the increasingly restive Soviet republics, Communist leaders admitted their party's past mistakes and agreed to talks with popular protest movements, they said.

Already, 22 local election bureaus in Lithuania have moved up the run-off election from March 10 to March 4, the official news agency has reported. Others are expected to follow, said Viktor Radzichius, a spokesman for the Lithuanian people's front, Sajudis.

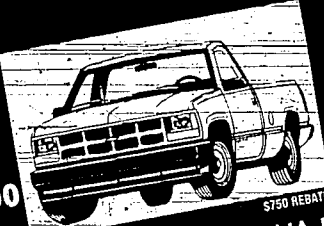

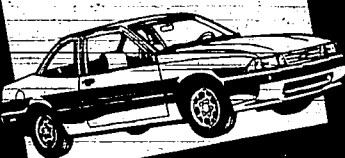

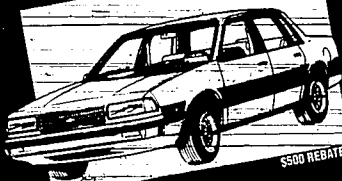

Hawkins bankruptcy checks to be sent in late March

State can't stop Rupert gasoline price warfare

RUPERT — For several months now, a gasoline war has given Rupert-area consumers prices that change hourly — sometimes to levels that may be below legal limits.

Prices have fluctuated between 82.9 cents and 97.9 cents, said Rupert Public Works Director Les Hutchinson.

Although he likes low prices, he buys gasoline for the city's vehicle fleet — some gasoline station operators aren't happy.

"I have gasoline stations that are fairly diversified," said Dave Hill of Hill Oil Co. "But gas is the biggest percentage of our business and if you don't make money on gas, you're in trouble."

Hill, who has a convenience store at his gasoline station, hasn't made money on gasoline sales since the gas wars started five or six months ago.

"At one period of time they were selling below cost," Dickson Oil Co.'s Gene Dickson said. "There's absolutely no profit."

The below-cost sales raise legal questions because of an Idaho law that sets minimum markups for retailers, such as gasoline stations.

The Depression-era act was written to eliminate unfair pricing competition.

In Rupert, the price war "is just terrific," companies fighting amongst themselves, Hill said.

V-L Oil Co. Operating Manager Leroy Buoy isn't among those who are upset.

"We've always tried to be fair with the public in every location we have been in," he said.

Are Rupert gas prices within legal limits?

"No way," Hill said. "Not even close." Although the gas-buying public may like low prices, competition could be hurt in the long run, he said.

"If all our independents are gone, then big conglomerates will take over," Hill said.

The state attorney general's office rebuked his request for help, he said.

"No money has been available to enforce it," Consumer Specialist Keith Bivens of the attorney general's office said.

"That answer doesn't satisfy Hill.

"From a business standpoint it's very odd that they tell us that portions of the legislation isn't funded, so there's nothing they can do," he said.

The attorney general's office has looked into too-low prices in the Twin Falls area. In November 1988, the office mailed letters to six Twin Falls gas stations asking them to review their pricing.

In Rupert, Bivens said gas station operators could file their own lawsuit.

"We've kicked it around," Hill said of the suggestion. "I don't know if we really want the publicity."

Rupert prices are, predictably, well below regional, state and national averages.

Spokesman Dave Carlson of the American Automobile Association said southeastern Idaho prices are 95.9 cents per gallon for regular and unleaded. State prices average \$1.053 per gallon and national prices are about \$1.20 per gallon.

Nationwide bus strike could affect Magic Valley

TWIN FALLS — About 100 people each day may be scrambling to find another way out of Twin Falls, or be stuck here — if Greyhound bus drivers go on strike.

Negotiators trying to avoid a nationwide strike by 6,400 Greyhound bus drivers were millions of dollars apart Thursday as a midnight deadline loomed.

The company worked to ensure no passengers would be stranded by a walkout, and the union questioned Greyhound Lines' willingness to reach a settlement.

Six buses pass through Twin Falls each day, area Greyhound Manager Edlen Steel said. Each bus averages about 13 to 20 passengers.

"We are more concerned than ever that Greyhound management is simply not prepared to negotiate if your folks don't show any interest in attaining a fair and equitable contract," said Jeffrey Nelson, spokesman for the Amalgamated Council of Greyhound Local Unions.

Greyhound Executive Vice President J. Anthony Lannie, who is heading the company's negotiating committee, said.

The company has acted in good faith throughout the four months of bargaining and has always assumed the union was acting in good faith, too.

The union last month rejected the company's initial offer by a 91.9 percent vote. The 3-year-old company, which is a successor to the Phoenix-based Greyhound Corp., and earned its first profit last year.

Greyhound says it serves 9,500 U.S. communities and is the only public utility transportation in about 400 cities.

The union, which represents 6,300 drivers and 3,075 of the company's strike and maintenance workers, has set a strike for 12:01 a.m. Friday local time, one minute after the three-year pact expires.

Nelson said working drivers would continue to their next stop, then join picket lines.

Greyhound spokeswoman Elizabeth Hale said the company advised passengers this week of the possibility of a strike, and worked to reduce the number of buses on the road at midnight.

"We'll do our best to get that person to their final destination and take care of his

or her needs in the interim," Ms. Hale said.

Representatives from both sides have been in negotiation ever since Feb. 16.

Falls strike negotiations resumed last month, but subcommittees resumed discussions Sunday and continued Thursday.

Drivers' wages were the main unresolved issue, with the company offering a 6.9 percent first-year increase and 13.5 percent during the three-year contract.

The company says the union wants a 33 percent first-year raise, a figure Nelson called "ridiculous and misleading." He could not provide a union estimate of the cost.

Greyhound valued its contract at \$60 million, and said the union proposal would cost \$496 million.

Hall was injured when he went to assist Mort.

Twin Falls police, who impounded the car, found a butcher knife, a lead pipe and a Baggie apparently containing marijuana in the car, according to court records.

One of the passengers was cited for carrying a concealed weapon and possession of marijuana, but Maxson said the charges were meant for the juvenile driver.

"I Twin Falls County Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Greg Swanson said there was a "miscommunication" that it being sorted out. He declined to comment further.

Hall is working mostly idle some times for the time being, though he may sometimes go out in a car, Maxson said.

The incident is still under investigation, Maxson said.

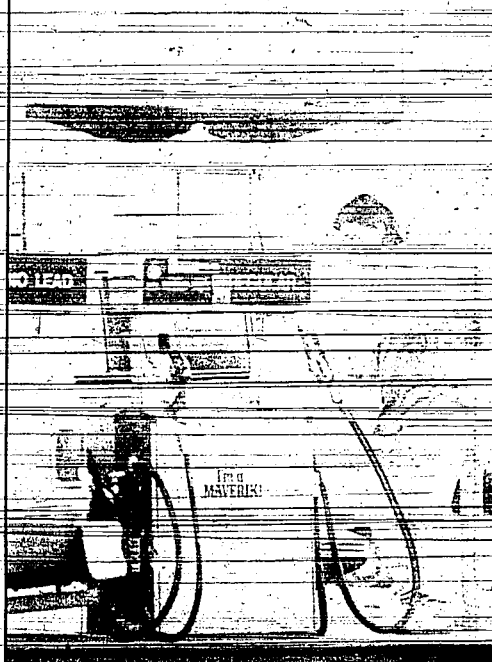

Elizabeth Paul resigning from alliance

BOISE (AP) — Elizabeth Paul, leader in the fight against plans for nuclear weapons plants in Idaho, is resigning as executive director of the Snake River Alliance.

Paul, of Ketchum, said Wednesday she will leave her position as executive director of the organization which has been accomplishing what she has termed as a "peace and justice" mission.

She was referring to the group's continuation of the scrapping of the Special Isotope Separator project — the plutonium-refinery — the Department of Energy, pushed hard to build at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

In January, the Bush administration decided not to fund the SIS, citing budget needs and plutonium availability. The plan would refine plutonium for use in nuclear weapons.

"The alliance, a peace and environmental group, which has 1,000 members, is beginning a search for a replacement," said Roger Hayes, board president.

Although SIS supporters have been killing the role of the alliance in killing the project, Hayes said it was instrumental in forcing delays so that reduced world tensions and budget considerations could catch up.

Although Paul has been a lightning rod for criticism from SIS backers in eastern Idaho, INEL spokesman Nick Nichols said, "She has done a good job of representing her group's point of view."

High court upholds ruling saying state can't set conditions on refiling

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Supreme Court ruled in a Twin Falls case that state magistrates have no authority to set conditions on refiling of criminal complaints they dismiss, but a dissenting justice contends that embargoes "justify shopping."

The 4-1 opinion issued Thursday upholds 5th District Judge Daniel Meehl's ruling that Magistrate Thomas Cushman was wrong to set conditions on refiling of drug charges against a Twin Falls woman.

Cushman dismissed a charge of possessing cocaine with intent to deliver against Jiwana Diaz in 1987.

Japan protests test reactor shutdown

WASHINGTON (AP) — Japanese physicists say U.S. plans to shut down a test reactor at the Hanford nuclear reservation would violate an international agreement and jeopardize future scientific partnerships between the two countries.

In a letter to Energy Secretary James D. Watkins made public Thursday, officials for the Japan Atomic Energy Research Institute said the administration's intent to shut down the Fast Flux Test Facility at Richland, Wash., "cannot help but impact negatively efforts toward future cooperation."

Sigeru Mori, chairman of the institute's Fusion Power Coordinating Committee, said discontinuation of FFTF would kill Japanese tests at the facility and more than five years of "intense international collaboration" on solid breeder materials for fusion blankets.

"It appears obvious that with the intent to shutdown FFTF, that you would imply an intent to break the agreement, since no other U.S. reactor has equivalent capabilities," Mori wrote in the Feb. 22 letter.

The letter was made public by aides to Rep. Sid Morrison, R-Wash., whose district houses the 560-square-mile nuclear reservation.

Schools will have the option of turning out transfers from outside the district if those transfers will place a hardship on the district or an individual school. Each school board will have to write a policy defining what qualifies as a hardship and outlining specific standards for accepting or rejecting applicants.

The bill specifically says that a district may reject a transfer student if a program, class, grade level or school building has already reached its capacity.

Districts will not be able to shut students for their previous academic record, handicapping conditions or lack of proficiency in the English language. And athletic or other extracurricular ability may not be included in the standards.

No district will be able to bar its students from applying for transfer to another district.

Minnesota, which already uses the concept, would be a good model for Idaho since it has an excellent high school graduation rate, co-sponsor Rep. Dick Davis, R-Burghard, said.

A little competition never hurt anybody," he said. "Schools that are doing a good job will have nothing to lose."

Moss says Idaho was never worried about Bunker Hill finances

BOISE (AP) — State Budget Director Chuck Moss says he advised federal Environmental Protection Agency officials two years ago that Idaho was not interested in dramatically expanding the business potentially responsible for financing the cleanup of the Bunker Hill smelter complex.

But Moss said Thursday he gave federal officials no indication that the state specifically wanted to exclude the Bunker Limited Partnership from that list of potentially responsible parties.

"It was discussed, the responsible party situation, but not exclusively concerning Bunker Limited," Moss said. "Our only concern, and I may have mentioned it, was our interest in not having a whole

congregation of potentially responsible parties to deal with."

Moss was the Andrus assistant identified in an investigative report from the EPA inspector general as having attending a Jan. 19, 1988, meeting in Seattle during which former Regional EPA Administrator Robie Russell allegedly discussed the negative financial impacts federal enforcement action would have on the Bunker Limited Partnership. The partnership took over the facility from Gulf Resources and Chemical Corp. after the complex closed down in 1981.

While the inspector general found Russell took extraordinary steps to block of delay enforcement actions against the partnership, it found no evidence that

Russell discussed the financial impacts even though Bunker Limited raised the issue at the meeting. At the time, Bunker Limited had a stock offering under way on the Canadian exchange.

Russell, who resigned as administrator earlier this year to join a Seattle law firm, called the report a hatchet job full of innuendo.

A letter to EPA Administrator William Reilly on Thursday, Andrus expressed concern about the inspector general's findings and offered the state's full cooperation in any further inquiry into problems surrounding the Superfund cleanup of lead contamination at the smelter complex and the surrounding areas.

The state of Idaho is fully committed to

the most rapid possible cleanup of the nation's largest Superfund site," Andrus said. "It is absolutely imperative that we accomplish this cleanup if we are to ensure the public health and safety, revitalize the local economy and hold those who are responsible for paying for the cleanup fully accountable."

The issue of who would ultimately reimburse the government for the multimillion-dollar Bunker Hill cleanup was a major issue around the time of the January 1988 meeting, Moss said, because Gulf Resources was pushing to add as many businesses as possible to the list of responsible parties that it headed.

Three weeks before the Seattle meeting, an internal EPA memorandum cited Gulf

Resources demands that the list be expanded to include all current and past owners of the smelter or other major facilities, major upstream mines and major suppliers and transporters of ore and concentrates.

It quoted Gulf Resources' Stephen Greiner as saying "it will take months to years to organize the PRP (potential responsible party) group and that the later those PRPs are named, the less likely these PRPs are to cooperate quickly."

While other businesses were expected to be added to the list, Moss said the state believed that any large expansion would only slow the cleanup work down more.

"It was based on our feeling that Gulf was the one that fouled the nest," he said. "We weren't anxious to have any more PRPs."

Commission advises counties how to resolve cable assessments

BOISE (AP) — While the State Tax Commission is bracing for a court battle on the valuation of cable television companies, the commission members have advised the counties how to resolve cable assessments for 1988 and 1989.

The memorandum acknowledges that the district court decisions to date have sided with the cable companies' stance they were wrongly socked with astronomical tax hikes in 1988.

TCI Cablevision of Lewiston has appealed Nez Perce County's valuation of its assets with a trial set for March 5 in Grangeville.

Cable TV concerns have jacked a number of counties to court after the Tax Commission advised them to assess the companies on their ability to earn and market value, as well as the traditional property values. The companies' 1988 taxes soared as the depreciated replacement cost of

standard property assessment.

"We think this is terribly wrong and unfair to your county's other taxpayers but, if you don't do it, the cable company's attorneys may force each affected county into expensive litigation under inauspicious conditions," the commission told the counties.

"District court decisions to date suggest that early and preliminary successes by the cable TV industry will be difficult to overcome. Doing so may mean a long and complex trial in each case."

The options the commission suggested included doing nothing if the cable companies did not appeal their allegedly inflated 1988-1989 assessments, or if they did appeal, the matter had been resolved.

If the companies' appeals are pending and they paid their untaxed taxes, the commission advised action by the counties. With the huge windfall in 1988 property taxes, the counties may ask their taxing districts for the extra money back.

If they already spent that, the taxing districts may have to withhold from current year distributions the money needed to pay the 1988 refunds.

The first half of the 1989 taxes were dispersed to the taxing districts about a month ago, the commission said, and may be retrievable.

TCI's assessment jumped from less than \$1.2 million to \$19.5 million.

The commission views the Nez Perce County issue as the test case that will set the tone for others across the state. Some 100 suits have been filed or are pending.

"We believe the proper resolution of the cable TV valuations issues plaguing our state must await a final ruling of the courts, following a fair and complete trial," the commission said in a memo to the counties.

Meanwhile, the counties must deal with the fiscal and administrative risks of further delay in resolving the tax issues for the past two years, the board said.

The "least risk" approach for the counties would be to refund any cable taxes in 1988 and 1989 over the depreciated replacement cost of

Idaho Space Station Expo 1990 ready to take off with simulation

The Idaho Space Station Expo 1990 project is off the ground, allowing Idaho students the simulated experience of life in deep space.

The 1990 simulation exercise was set to begin at noon Thursday at the Discovery Center in Boise. During the two-day experiment, 10 students in grades 7 through 12 will take turns living inside a model space station in 24-hour shifts.

Rob Campbell, technology supervisor for the Idaho Department of Education, designed the space station that edged out international competition for a \$5,000 grant from the Challenger Seven Fellowship.

The fellowship was founded by the families and friends of the astronauts who lost their lives in the 1986 explosion of the space shuttle Challenger.

The student astronauts will conduct over 200 in-soil sampling, atmospheric testing, and the launching

of a simulated satellite with a robotic arm. They will communicate with their colleagues at a mock mission control center via an intercom system, video camera, and a computer network.

A second session will begin Monday and end Wednesday.

But the pupils actually taking part in the event are only a fraction of those who made the project come alive.

A big part of Campbell's project is his multidisciplinary approach, involving hundreds of students studying home economics, math, science, fine arts, industrial arts, English and journalism.

High school students were asked to submit designs for a flag, space suit, space station, and logo, sample menus, and experiments. Students were eligible to apply for one of the 20 astronaut mission control positions.

Lapwai teachers finish negotiations for 1989-90, ready for next round

LAPWAI (AP) — After almost a year of negotiations, Lapwai teachers finally have a contract for the 1989-90 school year — just in time to start negotiations for next year.

The current contract was settled late Tuesday before an arbitrator was scheduled to meet with representatives from the teachers' union and the school district, Lapwai Schools Superintendent Robert J. Sobotta said Wednesday afternoon.

"Things were decided before the

arbitrator showed up," Sobotta said. Those "things" included a \$350 boost in base salary for teachers, additional money for educators with masters' degrees and additions to the district's benefit package.

Sobotta said.

The base salary for the 1989-90 school year was settled at \$16,700, while the pay scale topped out at \$29,793 for experienced teachers with advanced degrees, Sobotta said. Benefits went up from \$170 to \$190.

Pullman nurses ask to join talks on merger

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) — Pullman Memorial Hospital's nurses want to be part of merger talks with Grifman Memorial in Moscow, Idaho.

And if they are left out, their union may sue.

"They're doing what they can to hide those talks. That concerns me," said Karen Walp, labor relations director for the Washington State Nurses Association union-based in Seattle.

In November, Grifman proposed joint operation of the two hospitals by Palouse Regional Health Corp., its parent company, HCA Management Co., which now runs Memorial Administrator Tom Grifman would operate both until a new joint hospital could be built.

Pullman nurses believe the sale of the hospital to Grifman is imminent and will end in the closure of the Washington facility.

"If you fail to meet your bargaining obligation to us, we will

instruct our attorneys to take appropriate legal action to halt what we view as unlawful action on your part," Walp wrote in a letter to Memorial Administrator Tom Grifman.

Board president Helga Bloom dismissed the letter, saying Pullman's hospital is not for sale.

"There is no basis to this letter," she said. "As far as the negotiation talks, they're not even at the stage where we can address this."

Instant lottery tickets bring \$40 million

BOISE (AP) — Idaho's instant-scratch lottery ticket sales have passed the \$40 million mark in just eight months, while the state's new Lotto America role has earned \$1.2 million in a month. Lottery Director Wally Hedrick has announced.

The Idaho Lottery is not a passing fad, Hedrick said Thursday. "We are here for the long run, devoted to raising funds for schools and public

buildings."

The scratch tickets went on sale last July 19. The Lottery Commission estimated they would bring in about \$25 million the first year. The 1,400 ticket retailers have earned more than \$2 million in commissions since July.

Hedrick said the on-line Idaho Super-Lotto has boosted instant ticket sales, which hit \$3.3 million in February.



Symms' amendment would protect 12 million wild acres

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — An amendment to Sen. James McClure's Idaho Wilderness Bill, prepared by Sen. Steve Symms, would protect 12 million acres even though Symms has been opposed to any more wilderness.

Symms, R-Idaho, could offer the "forest" plan implementation provision as an amendment on the floor if Republican McClure moves his bill.

But Symms' aide Trent Clark said the senator is offering the plan not to protect wilderness, but to help free the remainder of the total 9.3 million roadless acres for multiple use.

Symms' proposal is not an attempt to rescue the McClure bill, Clark said. It's a counterproposal to the McClure bill.

Congressional approval would amount to a "stamp of approval" for the U.S. Forest Service's land management planning decisions in Idaho in the event they are appealed.

This would strengthen the agency's position in court, Clark said. It would provide stronger assurances that logging and other activities could take place in the non-wilderness roadless areas.

The McClure bill, hammered out with Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus, would establish 1.4 million more acres of wilderness plus use about 500,000 acres of special-use areas with some restrictions.

The bill has cleared the Senate Energy and Natural Resources

Committee. But Andrus withdrew his support over a dispute about a provision that would have allowed the secretary of Agriculture to remove areas with unimproved roads from wilderness designation.

McClure has not said whether he would continue to push his bill. He also has not said whether he would support a Symms proposal.

"McClure is adamant that anything that goes through has to be neutral on rights," said H.D. Palmer, McClure's press secretary. "There were a bunch of environmentalists who were unhappy with his bill at 1.4 million. I can't see them happy with 1.2 million."

Symms' provision removes several key areas from wilderness designation, including the Mallard-Larkins in northern Idaho, the Palisades and Bear Creek areas in eastern Idaho and several areas in the Payette National and Boise national forests. But it has boundaries attractive to conservationists in the Boulder, White Cloud and Pioneer mountains in central Idaho.

Stan Trier, regional forester for

the Forest Service in Ogem, Utah, said, since Symms' plan would be his agency's wilderness proposals, he expects it will support the plan.

"We can't support it," said Craig Gehrke, the Wilderness Society's regional director in Boise. "The Forest Service recommendations are too small."

Gehrke said that if Symms' proposal tries to prevent legal recourse for opponents to timber sales, then Congress probably will pass it. But if it removes the language in the McClure bill opposed by conservation groups, they may have a hard time stopping its passage.

"We would be hard-pressed to convince them to support a clean wilderness bill," he said.

Joe Hinson, vice president of the Idaho Forest Industries Council, said he was unaware of the proposal. But the timber lobbyist said his group, which opposes the McClure bill, might support Symms' plan.

Idaho Conservation League public lands director Mike Medberry said if such a measure passed the Senate, conservationists would try to add wilderness areas in the House.

But he said Symms' involvement still makes passage of a wilderness bill this year unlikely.

"Symms has not shown himself effective at passing legislation," Medberry said. "He has shown an unwillingness to compromise on his dogmatic viewpoints."

Company wants to melt PCB-laden transformer cores at Idaho Falls site

POCATELLO (AP) — The state Air Quality Bureau is proposing to allow an Idaho Falls incinerator to melt down power transformer cores for their metal, while falling within emission standards for the PCBs within.

Polychlorinated biphenyls, or PCBs, were used as a chemical insulator in electrical equipment for years but have been found and other being linked to cancer. Strong public opposition emerged to two proposed PCB incinerators in Kellogg and Nampa in the 1980s.

The \$100,000 copper reclamation furnace that Tiffany Metals plans to build would be the third of its kind in the nation. Two are operating in

anything you're going to have smoke," Reinbold said.

An incinerator stack will be the unit's only source of air emissions, which potentially will include mostly particulates and nitrogen oxides, but also minor amounts of carbon monoxide, hydrochloric acid, PCBs and dioxin.

"It's just an incinerator. It's not a huge, massive thing," Reinbold said. "It's no larger than what a house would cover. It's not that big that it would be polluting the whole city."

It will include a primary combustion chamber where metal will be melted down for salvage and a secondary circular chamber where smoke is retained for a brief period. PCBs and other toxins can be eliminated, he explained.

The Idaho Department of Health and Welfare this week approved a construction permit for Tiffany Metals, but the public has 30 days to comment and another 15 days will be allowed to revise the permit. A

public hearing has been set for March 27 in Idaho Falls.

The permit calls for source testing or monitoring the furnace, Reinbold said. Tiffany Metals initially applied for the permit last March.

Fred Tiffany, company president, estimates the final price tag on the furnace, including installation will be \$100,000.

Some \$30,000 would go to an extra-high temperature afterburner approved by the EPA.

His recycling and salvage company plans to erect the incinerator on Idaho Falls' southwestern edge near Interstate 15.

Operations would begin by mid-summer.

"Idaho could use one of these. To my knowledge, we don't have one in the state yet," Tiffany said, noting that incinerators were planned for Kellogg and Nampa, but were rejected because they lacked the high-tech afterburners.

\$661,000 private gift is largest ever for ISU

POCATELLO (AP) — The Kasiska Family Foundation has presented the largest private donation ever made to Idaho State University, worth \$661,074.

The gift was made Thursday to ISU President Richard Bowen.

"Some \$378,000 will go to the Kasiska scholarship program to help students in the various health sciences taught at ISU," said Larry Christensen, development director at ISU.

The \$283,000 will support public health education programs like the Spinal Cord Injury Prevention Program and the annual Governor's Health Care Conference in Pocatello.

The third part, \$282,074, will be used to "buy" health science equipment which has been unavailable from the state. The items range from X-ray equipment to blood pressure kits.

The foundation also has issued a challenge to ISU to raise \$100,000 toward purchase of a transmission electron microscope. It will cost up to \$300,000.

Having such an instrument would enable ISU to attract more quality faculty.



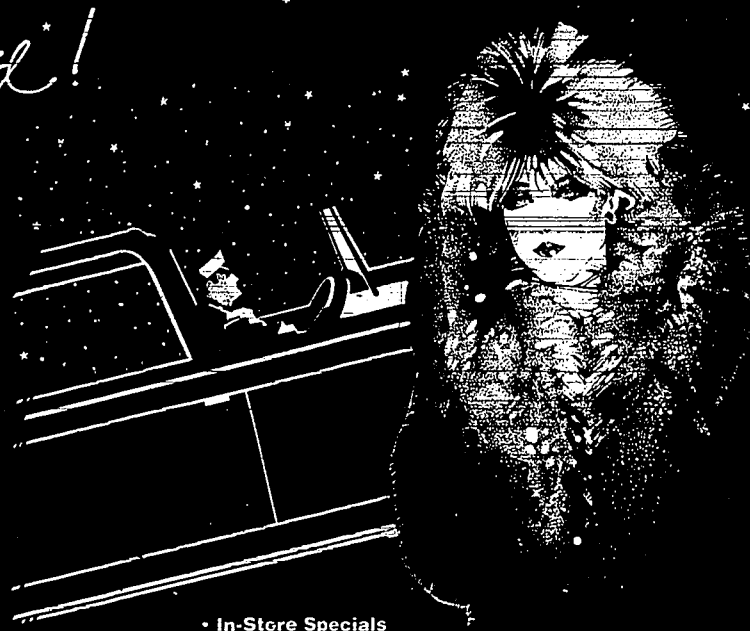

The maximum penalties are life in prison and a \$25,000 fine.

Nash remains in custody in the Latah County Jail.

Magistrate William Hammett, who appointed a public defender to represent him.

A preliminary hearing has been scheduled for Tuesday.

Nash was the starting point guard for the Big Sky Conference champion UI basketball team last season.

He remains a student at Idaho, and was an assistant football coach for Moscow Junior High School last fall.

In November 1987, Nash was convicted of shoplifting from a local store.

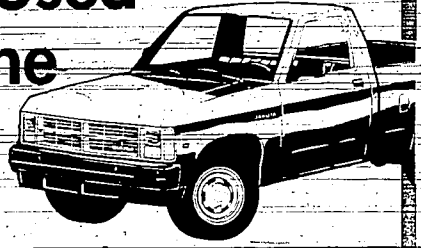
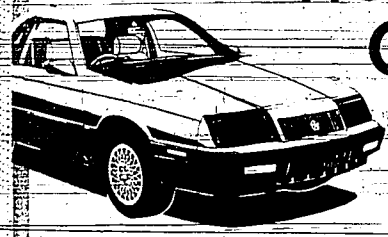

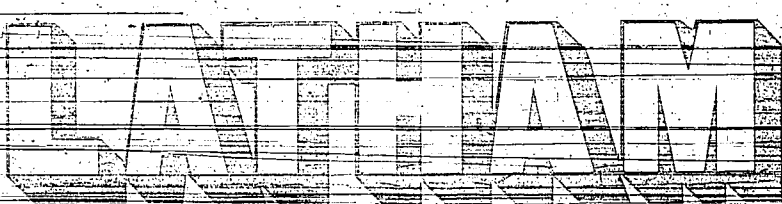

Boston lawyer goes Hollywood to write for 'LA Law'

LOS ANGELES — Four years ago, David Kelley was practicing law with a prestigious Boston firm. He was a good lawyer and probably would have become a partner.

But Kelley, he quit to go to Hollywood. Now he's in charge of the most profitable TV firm in America: MCA/ABC/Universal/Viewer/Slattery/Kuzak & Becker.

Kelley, 33, is executive producer of NBC's "LA Law." And as such he's counseling the Emmy-winning show through one of its most creatively successful seasons.

NBC President Brandon Tartikoff said recently that many at the top-rated network consider this to be the show's best year. Even series creator Steven Bochco is thrilled. "The smartest thing I'm doing this year is letting 'LA Law' just stay out of these guys' hair."

Kelley has put his stamp on the show in several ways. He created the long and compelling story line about the capital murder case involving a professor represented by Michael Kuzak and decided to do more stories involving Annie Becker and Victor Sifuentes. He's got such a presence in the courtroom as writers, we all love to write for him," and introduced the character of Rosalind Slyng, the ruthlessly mercenary new partner.

"We focused a little more on office politics," Kelley said. "They are a family, but it's a business as well. Most people are influenced under the business."

Kelley took over the series last summer from Bochco, capping an unusual career change that happened almost by accident.

"I never thought I would take up writing as a profession," Kelley said in a recent interview. "I was happy as a lawyer. Even now, he is sometimes struck by the fact that he's a Hollywood producer, and a trial attorney. On the one hand, it's such a change from what I was doing 3 years ago," Kelley said. "But on the other

Miami rap group offers to place warning sticker on their albums

MIAMI - Miami-based rap group 2 Live Crew—under investigation for distributing obscene records, has offered to place a warning on their album stating it is for adults only.

The group will place a sticker on their records that reads: "Warning—Explicit Language Contained—Parental Discretion Advised, 18 & Older Only." The records covers already state the material is sexually explicit.

News of the new move to head off anti-pornography activists came in a letter sent to Florida record stores last week.

The four-member group already puts out a clean and shiny version of their current album, "Disky Walker Records." The dirty version, "As Nasty As They Wanna Be," has sold 1.3 million copies in four months, with hit songs such as "Me So Horny." Only 200,000 "As Clean As They Wanna Be" discs have been sold.

That tells you what people want. People want the X version," said Luther R. Campbell, owner of Skywalk Records and a member of 2 Live Crew.

Gov. Bob Martinez asked the state prosecutor last week to determine whether the group and record company violated state obscenity and racketeering laws by distributing the album.

Campbell said the group's material, which graphically depicts sex, was no worse than records put out by comedian Eddie Murphy or other music groups. However, 2 Live Crew is the only group to place warning stickers on its albums and put out a clean version of its songs, he said.

hand, there was a very steady progression, step by step, from the moment I arrived."

Steady, but nevertheless remarkable. Many writers toil for years in Hollywood before finding an agent, selling a script or winning a staff job on a show.

For Kelley, those accomplishments came in a rush. His success is testimony both to his ability and to the insatiable hunger for good writers in Hollywood. Like Dick Wolf's former advertising executive who now produces action shows, for ABC, NBC and Fox, or Gary Dayal Goldberg, who ran a day-care center before creating "Family Ties," Kelley moved with incredible ease from reporter to writer.

Robert Kelley, 29, said, "I'm amazed. David is an amazing writer. The show this season is every bit as good, if not better, than it ever was."

Capsule reviews

BORN ON THE FOURTH OF JULY (R)

No one can doubt director Oliver Stone's sincerity, any more than they can his talent for bravura emotionalism. Possibly because Stone emphasizes so enormously with his main character — co-writer Ron Kovic, who came back from Vietnam at age 21 paralyzed from the chest down — the director has lost the specificity that made "Platoon" so electrifying. His scenes, and their ironic juxtapositioning, explode like land mines. Tom Cruise does it very physically; empathy, the ability to work full throttle, and a quality of defensiveness that is terribly touching.

DRIVING MISS DAISY (PG)

Morgan Freeman gives an immensely gracious and subtle performance as an Atlanta chauffeur in this rather musty adaptation of Alfred Ury's 1987 Pulitzer Prize-winning play. Jessica Tandy is the cranky widow. Their performances give the film a human gravity that helps counteract the too-measured pacing, its tone of comic tragedy. A better title for Steven Spielberg's remake of the soppy 1943 Spencer Tracy movie "A Guy Named Joe" might be "Forever," which is roughly its running time. Richard Dreyfuss can do no better than his dialogue or his situation — or his direction.

'Music Box' proves steadily engrossing

Costa-Gavras, who has been known to lose his footing now and then, as he did with "Betrayed," regains his balance with "Music Box," a reasoned, steadily engrossing film which, despite its in-ability to play like the best of mysteries, the best of courtroom dramas.

The PG-rated film is also strong on performance. Armin Mueller-Stahl plays a Hungarian immigrant, a refugee who has worked in a factory in Chicago where he raised two children, one of whom is a trial lawyer. When Mike Laszlo (Mueller-Stahl) is accused of having been a Nazi war criminal almost 50 years before, he angrily denies the charges, insisting that he has been confused with someone else. This kind of thing has happened before, he says.

His children believe him. They must. They simply cannot accept the notion that their father, always a loving figure to them, could have been capable of doing the things of which he is accused. His daughter, the lawyer, defends him in court against adverse others, who think he is not innocent.

Ann Tolson (Jessica Lange), however, is convinced of her father's innocence. She is certain that she is taking no chances. In time, however, she begins to have doubts. Her legal investigator finds out that her father has been paying regular sums to a cab driver. Is it blackmail? Does it have anything to do with her father's past? Is he really the best they say he was?

At the trial, witnesses swear that her father is the man who did those terrible things to them and others. Susan and her father, however, are convinced that Jack Burke (Frederic Forst), some of these witnesses are successfully challenged by the defense, and, once more, we wonder if the charges are valid. The daughter reluctantly pursues a lead. First, she goes to Budapest, Hungary, and then returns home, where she uncovers evidence that settles the matter. It isn't fair to say which way the trial goes, but it won't surprise you. You will, however, remain with the film until the very end.

"Music Box" touches on those and related issues. The attorney's former father-in-law, a corporate lawyer, has informed his grandson that the Holocaust never really happened, that it is all a hoax. He had dined with high-ranking Nazis, and to him, they were just ordinary people.

Then there is the judge, the man who presides at this hearing held to determine whether the Hungarian's citizenship should be revoked. The judge is Jewish, and, as played by J.S. Black, is soft-spoken and determinedly fair. It is one of the better characters in the movie.

"Music Box" considers all the potential of this situation. As it does, it moves along, evenly and surely, always on course. Lange makes the most of her scenes, particularly the closing ones, and Mueller-Stahl is correctly cast as her father. "The Music Box" is a film that has made a number of 10-best lists and for very good reason.

'Miss Daisy' still surging from Oscar nominations with \$6.1 million week

'Lethal Weapon 2' tops video sales, No. 2 on rentals chart

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Still surging from its leading nine Oscar nominations, "Driving Miss Daisy" crossed \$6.1 million at the nation's theaters, according to recently released figures. "Warner Bros.—has estimated—that the film Academy Award nomination collecting on Feb. 13 should boost the film's revenues by \$20 million, and so far the prediction is holding true, according to the box-office numbers gathered by Exhibitor Relations Co. "Miss Daisy," which grossed \$10.8 million last weekend, has now sold more than \$53 million worth of tickets, with the bulk of income coming in the last three weeks. The movie opened in December. Starring Jessica Tandy and Morgan Freeman, "Miss Daisy" could be dethroned from the No. 1 spot next weekend by the much-anthipex "The Hunt for Red October." Another surprise hit, "Hard to Kill," finished in second place with receipts of \$5.4 million, making \$27.5 million in three weeks. The poorly reviewed film stars Steven Seagal as a policeman with a bad attitude, with his wife, Kelly-Le Brooks, playing a supporting role. "Madhouse," with John Larroquette and Kristie Alley as a couple, entertaining impossible house guests, landed in third place with a gate of \$4.4 million. It was followed in fourth by the Kevin Costner film "Revenge," which made \$2.9 million and is fading. "Born on the Fourth of July," in fifth, hasn't enjoyed a great boost from its eight Oscar nominations. The film collected \$2.5 million, but 16.3 per screen average has weakened to \$12.55. In sixth was the Jessica Lange movie "Men Don't Leave," crossing

\$2.7 million in a limited release of 802 screens. In seventh was the horror film "Nightbreed," from novelist-director Paul Verhoeven, with \$1.8 million. The Civil War melodrama "Glory" netted \$1.68 million for eighth place. Despite its critical acclaim, the film is flailing at the box office, having made just \$18.4 million in 11 weeks. 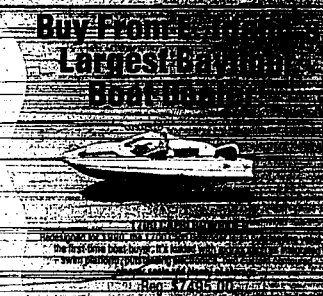

Drama depicts impact of POW camp murder on WWII-era American town

By A.A. HOOGENBOOM

Walter Matthau returns to television this week after an absence of more than 20 years. He plays a small-town attorney forced to defend a German POW accused of murder in "The Incident." The AT&T presentation, filmed on location in Colorado Springs, airs Sunday, March 4, on CBS.

During World War II, 500 POW camps were spread throughout the United States. These camps held 400,000 German, 50,000 Italian and 5,000 Japanese prisoners of war who were fortunate to be interned in America, where food was plentiful and the Geneva Convention was respected. But the German camps had their dark side: Many had conflicts between Nazi and non-Nazi prisoners.

Such tensions inspired Jim Norell with his brother Michael to write the fictional screenplay for "The Incident."

After town physician Doc Hansen (Barnard Hughes) is beaten to death in the POW camp, Harmon Cobb (Matthau) is forced by a manipulative judge (Harry Morgan) to defend Wilhelm Geiger (Peter Firth), the POW accused of the murder.

At first, Cobb's only concern is to avoid appearing foolish against the Harvard-trained prosecutor (Robert Cafradine). But after police chief John Wallace (William Schallert) presents Cobb with new evidence, Cobb comes to believe that Geiger might be innocent.

"I haven't done a non-comedic role in a long time," says Walter

Matthau. This was a role with a specific point and moral: that in the United States of America, everyone gets a fair shake, regardless of race, creed, gender, circumstance or disposition. Everyone is equal under the law. It is a moral that should be stressed over and over again so that people don't forget.

For Schallert, who plays the town's police chief, working with Matthau is nothing new. They first met 30 years ago while filming "Lonely Are the Brave." "Walter played a sheriff tracking down Kirk Douglas," recalls Schallert, "and I played his boneheaded deputy. In another film with him, I played a boneheaded sheriff, and now in "The Incident," I play a sharp chief of police. It seems that I always play law-enforcement guys with Walter."

Coincidentally, Schallert did his basic training in World War II at Camp Carson, in Colorado Springs. This is also where Paul Baschleben, who served as technical advisor for "The Incident," was imprisoned. Baschleben was captured at age 19 in Italy and sent to the United States. "The Afrika Korps was already

here," he says. "We latecomers were shunned. They felt they were still the master race."

"The Incident" successfully evokes a bygone era. Spectators fanning themselves in courtroom scenes remind viewers that this was before most public places had air conditioning. It seems a simpler time: Old cars putter down tree-lined streets, and everyone guzzles coffee without worrying about caffeine. But director Joseph Sargent depicts underlying tensions: Vandals paint swastikas on Cobb's house, and some townspeople refuse to speak to him.

This show belongs to Walter Matthau, and one cannot imagine anyone playing Harmon Cobb better. Most viewers will want to pull up a chair and hunker down for two hours of pleasurable viewing.

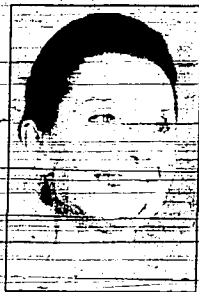
and his wife. Next on Hepburn's agenda is a national concert tour narrating words from "The Diary of Anne Frank" set to orchestral accompaniment.

Beecroft moves to 'General Hospital'

You may not know it, but the soaps have a hot line: An actor can die on an East Coast camera and be working in L.A. two weeks later.

That just happened to Greg Beecroft, formerly known as Tony Reardon of "Guiding Light." After a four-year run, Greg turned up as Brock on "As the World Turns." Brock received last rites in mid-January as Beecroft vacationed in Florida.

But the word was out on the pipeline and "General Hospital" made the first pitch. Come west young man and play Jonathan Paget, formerly known as Duke Lavery, living another life under government protection, ever since he squealed on the mob. Risking everything, Paget returns because he misses his dear wife Anna (Finola Hughes). Jonathan thinks plastic surgery will fool mobster Julian Jerome (Jason Culp) and his hoods. It's called wishful thinking.

The Texas-born Greg Beecroft waves off viewer skepticism over the idea of a man who is presumed dead coming back to enemy territory. As for the government protecting an informant forever, well, says Greg, there's a limit to sanctuary. Even ex-presidents lose Secret Service protection after a respectable period.

So there is Duke now. Jonathan, risking his life to feast his eyes once again on his beloved Anna. How long will he last before the Jerome gang wakes up?

Greg Beecroft doesn't know. He's good for 13 weeks at least. And that could turn into a decent run. Beecroft is happy with his new California surroundings since he's just spent 10 years living in Manhattan's Hell's Kitchen.

"General Hospital" is a big-city soap," Greg explains. "Guiding Light" and "As the World Turns" appeal to regional audiences. I've only been working a month as Paget, and I can tell you the response is much greater. This is the big time."

Beecroft notes that New Yorkers disdain the West Coast soap. "It gets a bad rap. I've concluded that it's really a matter of jealousy.

"General Hospital" is simply too successful."

A fourth-generation Texan, Beecroft can survive in Hell's Kitchen, but he remains a country boy. Between soaps Greg motorcycled all over the United States and Canada. He raves about the beauty of the land and the friendliness of the country folk.

But don't get him started on the developers, the lack of communal planning or the ravages of greed. The Texan in him comes out and he's willing to take on the spoilers.

"The only way you can compete with the developers is with a lot of money," adds Greg. "My bucks go to the Nature Conservancy. We snatch away a little patch here, a little patch there. Buying time."

The actor sees some hope. "Oh,

the sweetness of the land. It's still out there. We haven't ruined it completely."

Special 'Videos' makes record stand in ratings against CBS' '60 Minutes'

Animated commercials among favorites

NEW YORK (AP) — Advertising that used animated characters — from dancing raisins to a drumming rabbit — scored well when consumers were asked to pick the best commercials of 1989.

Ads with surprise endings or unusual twists, such as cats that appear to have human voices, also did well, according to the 11th annual survey by Video Storyboard Tests Inc.

Celebrities touting products were not as popular in the top 25 ads, Video Storyboard President David Vadchra said Friday.

The 1989 survey results, based on interviews with 24,000 consumers across the country, were led by commercials from McDonald's Corp.

The Oak Brook, Ill.-based company's advertised promotions last year that included tie-ins with the movies "The Little Mermaid" and "All Dogs Go to Heaven."

Vadchra said the commercials that consumers cited most often from McDonald's were one called "First

Love" that showed a young boy bidding goodbye to the girl he met at McDonald's as he and his family move to another neighborhood, and one in which people recited the menu in a rap song.

Second were ads for Pepsi and Diet Pepsi, many of which contained celebrities. But Vadchra said the Pepsi ad consumers cited most often featured monkeys who get the right soft drink from the vending machine for the researcher studying their behavior.

The California Raisin ads featuring a claymation version of entertainer Michael Jackson placed third. The campaign slipped somewhat after ranking first in each of the past two years.

Commercials for Energizer batteries featuring a pink toy rabbit that played a drum and showed up without warning in ads for other products came in fourth for the year. Vadchra said the ad was unusual in that it not only captured attention but "made the point that the battery goes on and on."

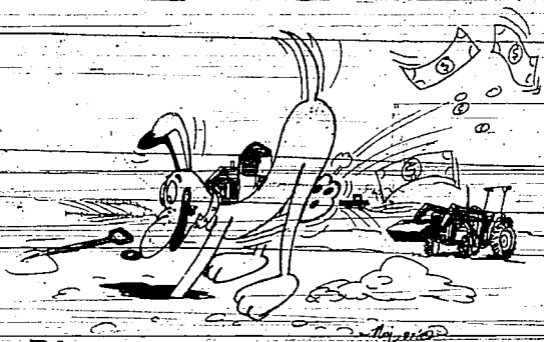

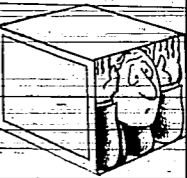
