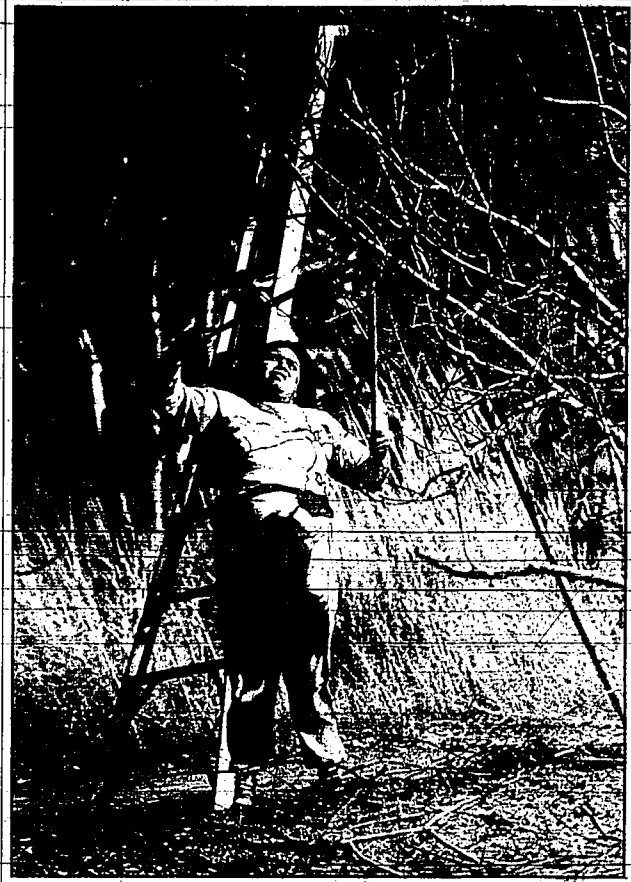

## Fire at Libya gas plant remains a 'whodunit'

WASHINGTON — The White House insisted Thursday that it played no role "of any kind" in a still-unexplained fire that apparently caused extensive damage to a Libyan industrial complex suspected of producing chemical weapons.

Libyan leader Col. Muammar Gadhafi suggested the fire was the work of West German saboteurs and threatened retaliation. But the Bonn government, which has acknowledged that West German companies had helped build the facility, denied any involvement.

Gadhafi also hinted at retaliation against long-time enemy Israel, which was rumored to have had a hand in Wednesday's blaze, but Israeli Defense Minister Yitzhak Rabin termed speculation about an Israeli role "nonsense."

A group of Libyan dissidents claimed responsibility in a statement

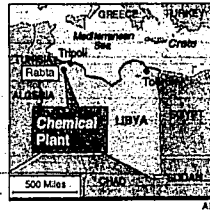
to a West German television news

bureau in Cairo on Thursday,

but U.S. officials said they knew

nothing about the group and could

not verify their claim.

"We don't know the origins of the fire. We don't know if it was sabotage. We don't have any idea who did it," said White House press secretary Marlin Fitzwater, who noted that the plant may no longer be functioning due to the severe damage.

"... Somebody could have knocked over a kerosene lamp or something. You never know."

The U.S. government has repeatedly accused Libya of building the facility to produce mustard gas, nerve gas and other chemical weapons. But Gadhafi has denied the allegation, declaring it wrong

Thursday that the heavily guarded complex near Rabata, 60 miles southwest of the capital city of Tripoli, was designed to manufacture only pharmaceuticals.

Just last week, the White House fended its charge that the plant is stockpiling tons of lethal chemicals and refused to rule out a U.S. military strike unless the facility were dismantled.

The close timing between the latest U.S. warning and Wednesday's incident prompted speculation that the U.S. government or an ally was behind the fire, which Fitzwater said is believed to have caused such "extensive damage" that the plant probably is no longer functioning.

But President Bush and his chief spokesman emphatically denied that the U.S. government was involved in the fire.

Bush said Wednesday night that he had no knowledge of the incident

when reporters asked again Thursday about a U.S. role, he said.

"No, but we've already said that," Fitzwater denied "any involvement of any kind."

## Amazon's forests key to climate

WASHINGTON — If the Amazon forests were all cut down and the land converted into a vast cattle pasture, rainfall in the region would plummet and temperatures would soar.

That would produce changes that could prevent the forests from ever returning, according to a study published Friday.

Estimates hold that 5 to 15 percent of the forest has been cleared and that at current rates of deforestation, the entire region could be little more than a scrubby grassland in 50 to 100 years.

The findings add a new note of urgency to efforts to protect the Amazon basin. Environmentalists and scientists have long argued its preservation because the forests harbor the world's greatest diversity of plant and animal species — half of Earth's biological diversity, according to some.

The new conclusion emerged from use of a supercomputer and a mathematical model of climate, including simulations of vegetation, to suggest what would happen if the rainforests of South America were turned into pasture. Their computer predicted that rainfall in the region would drop from the current average of about 100 inches a year to 75 inches a year. Evaporation of water from plants and the soil, which may contribute as much as half of all the water that now falls on the Amazon, would also be greatly reduced.

Average temperatures in the region would climb by almost 5 degrees

## Food safety lab could wind up at Kimberly

BOISE — To combat consumer uncertainty about agricultural products, the Idaho Legislature's budget-writing committee agreed Thursday to fund a state-run crop quality-assurance center.

If approved by the House and Senate, the \$2-million center would be owned by the Idaho Department of Agriculture but operated by the University of Idaho College of Agriculture.

It would provide a place for growers and dealers to submit crops for pesticide residue tests and certification of safety.

Sen. Lynn Tomingaga, R-Rupert, said the committee's consensus is the center would be located in Kimberly or on the College of Southern Idaho's Twin Falls campus. Idaho Falls has also been discussed as a possible location.

"It's good news to the food safety issue we're all facing,"

said Gale Kleinkopf, superintendent of the University of Idaho Research and Extension Center at Kimberly. "We don't have anything at the state level to analyze and do pesticide screening work."

A testing laboratory built recently on the University of Idaho campus in Moscow has been used primarily for re-registration of agricultural chemicals, not for testing foods, Kleinkopf said.

The Department of Agriculture will make the final decision on where to locate the center, Tomingaga said.

"We just wanted to make sure the money was there."

The center might be open by next year and it might also serve as a place to certify organically grown products, Tomingaga said.

## Gorbachev sees hard times ahead

MOSCOW — Mikhail S. Gorbachev granted a new, more powerful presidency on Thursday, said his immediate tasks were to prevent the Soviet Union from breaking up and to promote free-market reforms.

In assuming powers as the Soviet Union's first Western-style president, Gorbachev warned in a speech at the Congress of People's Deputies that the reforms required to right his country's woeful economy would be painful.

Mindful of his nation's history of dictatorship and terror, Gorbachev promised legislators he would nurture the Soviet Union's "young and not fully developed democracy."

Gorbachev, who ran into surprisingly strong opposition in the Soviet Congress before assuming the new presidency, will now have wide powers to propose legislation, negotiate treaties, veto bills, appoint the

Council of Ministers and void its decisions.

Significantly, he also has the power to declare war if the country is attacked and under certain conditions impose direct presidential rule. This means he could overrule a local government.

He has shifted his formidable powers further from the Communist Party leadership to the government. On Wednesday, the Congress struck the party's constitutional monopoly on power to permit development of a multiparty system.

Gorbachev mentioned specifically the need to overcome the irresponsibility that was a byproduct of collective leadership, saying, "An increase of responsibility is the main thing on which we rely."

He said in his speech at Congress, "Our country is living through diffi-

cult times. But if we act together, we will overcome the difficulties. We must strike off fears and regain a confidence in our strength and possibilities, which are truly great. The Russian people and all peoples united with it in a great multinational state will succeed in reviving their common homeland, and will surely achieve that on the roads of perestroika and socialist renewal."

He added, "I see my role and task as the president of the U.S.S.R. in affirming national harmony in the country and a spirit of mutual respect, consolidating the principles of civil peace and harmony, protecting the interests of the people."

Voting — results announced Thursday at the Congress indicated a significant drop in support for the Soviet leader, since he was chosen chairman of the Soviet legislature in May. That position was essentially a weak presidency.

## Nancy's astrologer takes credit for thaw

WASHINGTON — Astrologer Joan Quigley said Thursday that the star-gazing advice she gave Nancy Reagan during Ronald Reagan's presidency influenced the course of history in big ways and small.

"I even steered the president away from his 'Evil Empire' view of the Soviet Union. In a book giving her version of her eight-year relationship with the Reagans — first disclosed in 1988 by fired Reagan adviser Donald Regan — Ms. Quigley asserted that she set the times some presidential events would occur down to the minute and sometimes even to the second.

When Reagan announced his selection of Anthony Kennedy for a seat on the Supreme Court on Nov. 11, 1987, she chose 25 seconds after 11:32 a.m. EST as the moment for the announcement. "A man with a stopwatch" gave

Reagan the signal for proceeding, she wrote. She said she also delayed the timing of Regan's first cancer operation in 1985 by three days and dictated when Mrs. Regan's mastectomy would take place.

Ms. Quigley says Regan knew of her influence on his wife and gave her a thank-you kiss when he finally met her.

Mrs. Regan, in her memoirs, "My Turn," wrote last year that while Ms. Quigley was "helpful and comforting ... a kind of therapist," she had "influence solely on Regan's schedule."

"No political decision was ever made based on it," she said. However, Ms. Quigley said that before

Reagan's first summit with Mikhail Gorbachev, she worked three hours to persuade Mrs. Regan that her husband could trust the Soviet leader.

"She said she 'battled her to the mat' to get Reagan's view of Gorbachev changed. "The placement of his ruler, Mercury, in the 8th house of power and position convinces me that Gorbachev came to power ... because of his 8th degree of intelligence," she said she told the first lady. "It symbolizes to me that despite his Russian training and origins, he has the instincts of a humanitarian."

Finally, the president's wife replied, "I know you are right," she said. "Through Nancy, I had a direct line to the president," Ms. Quigley wrote.

"I was responsible for timing all press conferences — most speeches, the State of the Union

# Snowstorms, tornadoes hit Midwest

Relentless thunderstorms that have hammered the Plains with tornadoes set off another twist: attack Thursday in Mississippi, and a snowstorm surprised the upper Midwest and closed schools.

The heat wave that has gently toasted much of the eastern half of the nation continued to set high temperature records.

Thunderstorms have spawned damaging tornadoes this week in Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Iowa, Nebraska, Kansas and Illinois.

This week's unusual winter heat wave and storms began with a strong low pressure system that moved through the Rockies onto the Plains, explained Ed Ferguson of the National Severe Storms Forecast

Center in Kansas City, Mo.

"In advance of that, we had a strong flow of warm air move through the Plains. These strong southerly winds brought a lot of warm temperatures and high humidities," Ferguson said. "In fact, that strong flow of air existed from the Gulf of Mexico to the Great Lakes."

"Those warm temperatures and high humidities set the stage for strong thunderstorm development because warm, moist air from the Gulf of Mexico was colliding with cooler, drier air from the northwest."

"As for the snow in the north, he said: "The patent low pressure system is still moving slowly. Up north, we're still dealing with what the system can produce."

North Dakota was under a winter

storm warning as snow and gusty north wind threatened the state with near blizzard conditions. Snowfall amounts were expected to range from 4 inches in the west to 10 inches in the east, the weather service said.

Wind gusted to 100 mph at Rapid City, N.D., and high wind blew across Minnesota and Wisconsin.

In Wyoming, wind blowing at more than 25 mph whipped up snow and cut visibility to zero along slippery highways, forcing the Highway Patrol to close a 45-mile stretch of Interstate 80.

Traffic also was kept off 14 miles of Interstate 25 from Cheyenne south to the Colorado line off and on because of accidents. No injuries were reported.

### Fanatics threaten to kill Americans

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — A fanatical Muslim organization threatened Thursday to kill three captive American educators unless the United States meets its demands, and also to attack airlines flying Soviet Jewish immigrants to Israel.

It was believed to be the first time that the fate of the hostages was tied to the issue of Soviet Jewish immigration.

The letter and statement Thursday from the Islamic Jihad for the Liberation of Palestine included a rare attack on the Soviet Union.

The group did not specify its demands. It previously offered to trade professors Robert Pollih, 55, of New York City; Alann Steen, 50, of Boston; and Jesse Turner, 42, of Boise, Idaho, for 400 Arab inmates of Israeli jails. Israel said no and the Reagan administration refused to pressure Israel.

All three men were kidnapped at gunpoint on Jan. 24, 1987, from the campus of the U.S.-affiliated Beirut University College.

Spokeswoman Margaret Tutwiler said that the Soviets are refusing to permit U.S. inspectors to use a "Cargoscan" X-ray device at the missile production facility at Volynsk and that some missile canisters subsequently have been shipped without being inspected.

She said U.S. inspectors at Volynsk, nearly 700 miles east of Moscow, have declared the refusal an "ambiguity," which she called "the most serious action our inspectors can take" under the on-site inspection provisions of the 1987 Intermediate-range Nuclear Forces Treaty, which bans missiles with ranges of 300 to 3,400 miles.

American and Soviet technical teams have been dispatched to the plant to examine the Cargoscan system, which the United States says meets the treaty's requirements for a non-invasive X-ray device able to determine what is inside a missile canister.

### Haiti's army refuses seat on council

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — The army has chosen not to be represented on a 19-member State Council that will govern Haiti along with provisional President Ertha Pascal-Trouillot, a political leader said Thursday.

Louis Roy, main author of the 1987 constitution, said that instead of representative of the Women's Movement will be appointed to the council, which will have veto power over the president's decisions.

### U.S. wants to use X-ray inspections

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States is pushing the Soviet Union to allow X-ray inspections of sealed missile canisters, as required by the treaty banning medium-range missiles, the State Department said Thursday.

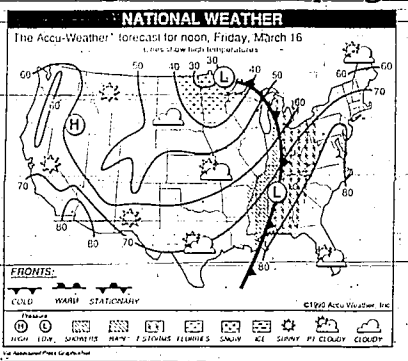

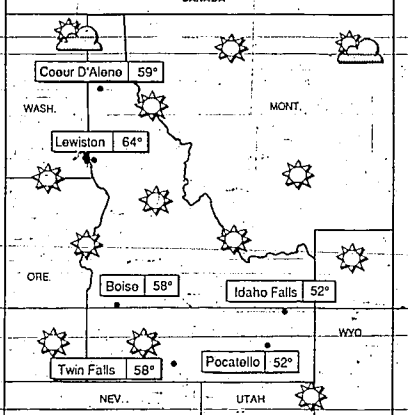

Among the most troubling, the computer simulation predicted that the dry season would also lengthen.

The new ban, published in Thursday's Federal Register, will go into effect in 30 days.

Bruce Silverglade of the Center for Science in the Public Interest applauded the ban on sulfite-treated potatoes, saying it was "long overdue and indicative of a new outlook on these types of problems" by the federal government.

Sulfites are used on peeled potatoes to keep them white and firm. The preservative usually is added after potatoes are cut up for distribution to fast food and other restaurants to be cooked as french fries and hash brown potatoes.

The ban will prohibit using sulfites on these potatoes before or after they reach the restaurant.

Robert Mercer, president of the National Potato Board, the promotional arm of the industry, said the ban "won't mean too much to industry" because there are alternatives to sulfites, though they are more expensive and less efficient. He also

said "it won't mean much difference to consumers."

The FDA said it also may ban use of sulfites on frozen potatoes that are distributed to restaurants.

This use is not common, the agency said, and when the preservative is used for this purpose, these products are required to be labeled as containing sulfites. However, a restaurant patron who is sensitive to sulfites probably would not see the label and could be at risk, the FDA said.

Sulfites are used as preservatives: sulfur dioxide, sodium sulfite, sodium and potassium bisulfite, and sodium and potassium metabisulfite.

When used in prescription drugs, wines and packaged foods including packaged potatoes the preservative must be noted on labels.

FDA spokesman Jeff Nesbitt said the agency had no plans to consider banning sulfites in canned or dehydrated potatoes. The industry maintains there is no alternative to sulfites for these products, he said.

the size of the potato harvest is an important factor," said Shukla, who added that other researchers believe that a loss of as little as a few hundred square miles would alter regional climate. "If you cut down half the Amazon, you would still have significant effects on rainfall and temperatures."

"You would want to know what kind of use would preserve the forest. If you would not maintain integrity of the hydrological cycle, you would probably have to preserve a predominance of woody vegetation," said Thomas Lovjoy, a tropical ecologist.

## Hole in ozone found in Arctic

Atmospheric scientists have confirmed that a hole in the ozone layer opened over the North Pole last winter.

While it was not as large as the better-known hole that occurs annually over the South Pole, they say that all the ingredients are there for a severe ozone depletion someday in the Arctic.

Clues to the possibility of a North Pole ozone hole emerged last year when researchers announced that the northern hemisphere harbored both the active chemicals and special cloud types needed to destroy large amounts of ozone. But the scientists said then that they could not be sure ozone was being destroyed in the Arctic until they analyzed streams of data collected by the NASA research aircraft that the NASA research polar regions.

Now, in a series of 63 papers published in the journal *Geophysical Research Letters*, the researchers confirm that at certain places and certain altitudes, from 15 to 12 percent of the ozone was destroyed over the Arctic.

# Gilbert lashes out at Andrus, launches bid for GOP nomination

BOISE (AP) — State Sen. Rachel Gilbert lashed out at Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus Thursday, renewing charges that he has become arrogant, as she entered the Republican primary for the right to face the incumbent in November.

"I am convinced the governor has lost touch with the people of this state," the five-term Boise lawmaker told a group packed with party leaders. "It is time for a change. I offer that change."

Mrs. Gilbert, only the second woman to launch a campaign for a major party gubernatorial nomination in modern Idaho politics, became the third Republican to formally enter the race to challenge Andrus' bid for a fourth term.

Former state Sen. Roger Fairchild of Eastland, a former White House aide, has established a committee to explore his possible candidacy.

But Mrs. Gilbert, a real-estate broker who chairs the state's tax-writing committee, reacted with mock surprise when asked about her primary opponents, declaring, "I'm really not running against anyone in

the primary except Governor Cecil Andrus."

With statements reminiscent of those made earlier this month by Andrus' longtime friend and former GOP Lt. Gov. Phil Batt, Mrs. Gilbert criticized the incumbent as arbitrary and no longer able to fairly or impartially govern.

She specifically cited the brief stint the governor's wife Carol had on a corporate board — a move Andrus has repeatedly admitted was a major mistake.

Andrus, in a statement, said the issue of the 1990 campaign was not "which political candidate can make the nastiest, meanest comments about Cecil Andrus," but that those politicians have done for Idaho, its education system, economy and

quality of life.

"I hope that once these political candidates have gotten the personal attacks out of their systems, they will start addressing the issues that are of real importance to the people of Idaho," the governor said.

Mrs. Gilbert said she acknowledged that the "people of Idaho deserve a clearer choice for the office of governor, and I believe I represent most clearly that choice for limited government, fiscal integrity, multiple use of public lands and freedom from agency intrusion into our lives."

She pledged to freeze state hiring, initiate a major debate on education reform, provide more state money for billions of dollars in needed road and bridge repairs, press her

campaign for lower taxes and strongly oppose the designation of any more land as wilderness.

But her tax-cutting efforts this session have been rejected by the Republican-dominated Legislature, and while backing a pending bill to funnel \$12.5 million from the record cash surplus to road and bridge repairs, she acknowledged that what would do little to solve a problem estimated at more than \$7 billion.

Eventually, she acknowledged additional money will have to be raised but "we need to know if the people are willing to pay for it."

The announcement ended weeks of speculation about the political future of the feisty lawmaker, who had publicly said she would not run

unless she had the enough cash to mount a credible campaign somewhere between \$600,000 and \$900,000.

She acknowledged she had not raised the \$600,000 "but I do have commitments across this state. Financial commitments are coming in now that give me a comfort zone."

The state chairman of both political parties welcomed Mrs. Gilbert's entry.

"I can get very bullish about her," GOP Chairman Randy Ayre said. "Yes, she's not the most timid person I've met, but so what? The governor doesn't exactly back down, either. You never have to worry about where Rachel Gilbert stands."

# House passes open records legislation

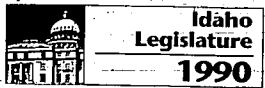
BOISE (AP) — With no opposing debate, the Idaho House has approved creation of a comprehensive law outlining what government records will be open to the public and detailing procedures for gaining access.

The 75-page "open records" bill, which passed 70-11 Thursday and was forwarded to the Senate, lays out a framework of requirements for seeking access to state and local government records, as well as for responding to requests.

Rep. Pam Bengson, R-Boise, the bill's floor sponsor, said it was aimed at consolidating and refining separate confidentiality provisions dealing with various agencies and subdivisions of government scattered throughout more than 100 sections of Idaho Code.

"We have a web of legislation that's very difficult to work with," Mrs. Bengson said.

But while the Idaho Press Club and the Idaho



Alfied Daily Newspapers endorsed the bill with only limited reservations, the president of the Idaho Newspaper Association called it "a sellout to state agencies."

"The passage of HB860 by the Idaho House is an unparalleled disaster for any citizen who believes that their government should be open and accessible," Tom Gros, publisher of the weekly Star-News in McCall, said in a prepared statement. "In one swoop, the House has endorsed more closures of public records in state and local agencies than in all of the previous legislatures combined."

The measure lists 36 types of records exempt from disclosure rules and dozens more temporary exemptions that will end automatically on July 1, 1993, unless lawmakers decide otherwise. That provision is aimed at forcing government officials to justify the need for their exemptions over the next three years.

The permanent exemptions include records required to remain confidential by federal law, trade secrets and other types of proprietary business information.

Also exempt would be information that might give someone an unfair competitive advantage in doing business with government agencies, sensitive personnel files and other records of such agencies as the Human Rights Commission, Department of Corrections, Lottery Commission and law enforcement investigatory records.

# Minimum wage hike compromise passes

BOISE (AP) — A compromise increase in Idaho's minimum wage has cleared the Legislature, guaranteeing thousands of workers in low-paying jobs the first raise in the basic wage in 13 years.

With just three dissenting votes on Thursday, the Senate gave final legislative approval to the bill that will raise the state minimum wage from \$2.30 an hour to \$3.80 on April 1 and to \$4.25 a year later.

"It's time when we let the waitresses and the waiters step to the front of the bus and not pass a bill that discriminates against these workers," said Democrat Michael Blackburn of Post Falls.

# House approves conflict of interest measures

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho House Thursday approved a bill requiring state and local officials to disclose any potential conflicts of interest, despite arguments it might deter people from seeking public office.

"This does nothing more than allow the sun to shine on our activities, both personally and collectively," said Rep. Jerry Deckard, R-Elgin, who sponsored the measure passed 73-9 Thursday and forwarded to the Senate.

"I think even used-car dealers have a code of conduct," he said. "Good heavens, we can do better than that."

The bill would not prevent public officials, including legislators, from being involved in situations or making decisions that might create conflicts of interest. But if the attorney general or some other public or private legal counsel

discloses it to the concerned agency or government subdivision.

State elected officials would be required to file a written statement describing the potential conflict with the secretary of state's office before taking any action. Intentionally failing to disclose a conflict would carry a maximum civil penalty of \$500.

"I think we're sending a message

to the people that this is what we believe in," said Rep. Mel

Richardson, R-Idaho Falls. "But others argued the requirements were unworkable and would put too great a burden on legislators and other public officials and might convince some people to avoid running for office or accepting appointments to the public sector."

"We as a citizen Legislature simply don't have the help and the resources to analyze every piece of legislation" for the possibility of a personal conflict, said Rep. Stan Hawkins, R-Ucon. "We don't even have the time to read every bill."

Hawkins also said subjecting public officials to a conflict of interest law, even one carrying only a relatively small civil penalty, could have a broader negative impact on their careers in or out of government.

However, Assistant Majority Leader Michael Simpson, R-Blackfoot, said the workings of state and local government often are a shadowy and confusing business to the general public, and ethics legislation would help eliminate some suspicion.

"The need is due to public perception," Simpson said. "It is necessary to pass some legislation dealing with conflict of interest in order to bolster confidence in what we do in this body."

# Budget writers send public works account into red

BOISE (AP) — Budget writers eager to meet some of the state's long-ignored capital improvement needs disbursed millions of dollars Thursday for public works projects, reducing the construction account below levels needed to meet future commitments.

In a series of votes, the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee approved construction of \$2 million food quality assurance laboratory, \$4 million for 300 more beds in the prison system, \$3 million for various remodeling and renovation projects and then over \$2.6 million to prepare and plan for future construction.

On the drawing board are a \$19 million women's prison and a \$50 million Law Enforcement Department headquarters.

"With still more proposals to be considered on Friday, Thursday's decisions coupled with projects authorized a day earlier left the public works account with a balance of only \$9.5 million. It once stood at \$66 million.

"We're running out of money," said House Appropriations Chairman Kathleen Gurnsey, R-Boise, but her request to choke off spending was

rejected.

The balance is over \$2 million below the level needed to meet commitments the current capital improvement budget makes on spending a year from now. That means authorized projects could be delayed or money would have to be funneled into the public works account from the general treasury.

The account was ballooned this year with \$42 million from a record cash surplus, but administration analysts believe that kind of cushion has been wrung out of the economy.

The account's future receipts also could be reduced if lawmakers trim the \$50 million budget reserve account to balance their 1991 government operating budget or underwrite programs budget writers have already ignored or rejected.

Interest from that reserve is earmarked for public works, and any

reduction in the reserve would reduce the interest going into the capital account.

Still, the committee's actions left intact much of the unprecedented four-year construction program Gov. Cecil Andrus proposed two months ago, although the governor's priorities were tinkered with.

"If they can hold the line from here on out, the governor's program will

have survived fairly well," Andrus Budget Director Chuck Moss said.

Among the miscellaneous projects approved by the committee was \$900,000 remodeling of the campus school at Boise State University, a \$520,000 remodeling of classrooms at Lewis-Clark State College, \$450,000 for a new National Guard Army unit in Emmett and \$770,000 for improvements in the prison system.

### Deliberate approach to 911 proposal best

Until recently, local officials were treating the enhanced 911 issue like a four-alarm emergency. They were talking about hurrying a proposal onto the May ballot, even though nobody — least of all the voters — had a clear idea of what the proposal would be. This week, however, Twin Falls County Commissioners asked themselves, "Where's the fire?" and wisely decided there wasn't one. Their patience is likely to pay off for the county — and maybe for other counties across the valley too. In brief, here's what the issue is about: State law lets counties put an optional surcharge on phone bills, as much as \$1 a month. With this extra money, public-safety agencies can pay for sophisticated, life-saving technology to dispatch emergency personnel. These electronic gadgets are amazing. They can lock onto your phone number as soon as you dial 911, so you can get help even if you pass out before talking to the dispatcher. Some of them show your address on a computer screen, or even a map of your neighborhood with the route outlined for speedier aid. Even great products, however, need good salesmanship. Up to now, Twin Falls County has a poor record on this point. In 1988, the commissioners asked voters to approve the \$1-a-month fee. They hadn't done much research, and they couldn't say exactly what they would use the money for. They got trounced at the polls. And if that happened, enhanced 911 in Twin Falls County might have been dead forever. Instead, to their credit, the commissioners have taken local business leaders' advice and are forming a citizens committee to study the possibilities and the cost. Some fascinating ideas are flying already. Among those ideas is a system to serve the whole Magic Valley. This notion could be a blessing for smaller counties that might never be able to afford enhanced 911 on their own. Whether such a concept would work is a matter for the committee to explore. The committee also can look into the available technology and help make sure the system is the best we can afford. A further advantage of a study committee will come after the exploring is finished. As the community saw last year's successful library expansion vote, broad citizen involvement in developing a proposal translates into a strong base of support for the final proposal. The county is on the right course. Although delaying the vote will delay the new 911 system a bit, this more thoughtful approach will have long-range benefits.

### Deficit reduction worth the effort

WASHINGTON — Before Rep. Dan Rostenkowski changed the nature of this year's domestic policy debate, he took a quiet ride down town last week from Capitol Hill to outline his grand budget strategy for White House Chief of Staff John Sununu and Budget Director Richard Darman. Christians don't do that. Recognizing that basic fact, Sununu and Darman said that if he went ahead and stuck his large nose out for a deficit-reduction plan that had National Interest stamped all over it, they would be supportive even as they staked out their differing views. Bush will move more slowly until he sees how much support Rostenkowski can command in Capitol Hill, but the fact remains that he is willing to listen, as a personal call to his longtime friend on Monday showed. Also, before detonating his bombshell, the chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee described the proposal in detail to House Speaker Thomas Foley and Majority Leader Richard Gephardt, well aware that he was proposing to interfere in the development of a Democratic plan under Gephardt's aegis by proposing a bipartisan initiative. Grandstanders aren't that solicitous, either. For the moment, Foley may have a tougher decision to make than Bush. For some time, it has been rumored for him and Senate Majority Leader George Mitchell, D-Maine, that taxes are taboo

for the congressional leadership to the extent they are taboo for the administration. So far, while he has nothing concrete from Bush beyond a White House expression of good will, he has the head of his tax-writing committee far out in front of him. Moreover, because the Rostenkowski move is by definition a prelude to National Interest budget talks between Congress and the White House, it would necessarily short-circuit the House Budget Committee's preparation of a 1991 spending plan. As has happened time and again over the last nine years as leaders have stepped forward with deficit-reduction plans, Rostenkowski's is vulnerable to opposition from each partisan pole. On the Republican side, for example, party chairman Lee Atwater has long championed "no new taxes," as too successful a GOP election theme to be sacrificed until this year's campaigns are over, if then. Similarly, Gephardt has been guiding Democrats toward themes that average Americans have been hit hard by the shifting federal tax burden of recent years, and that a large "peace dividend" should be used to begin rebuilding some of the country's shrunken public institutions (notably education, transportation, health care and housing). However, as Senate Finance Committee Chairman Lloyd Bentsen, D-Texas, keeps reminding-

me, it is also true that the average American is being cheated by the stalemated status quo here: a never-ending cycle of \$100 billion-plus budget deficits that are pinching living standards, undercutting the country's already declining manufacturing economy and leaving interest rates much higher than they need to be to finance a \$3 trillion and growing national debt. Not surprisingly, Bentsen was one of the first heavy hitters to encourage Rostenkowski, as was another good-guy veteran of budget talks in the 1980s, Senate Republican leader Bob Dole. Compromises hurt, and big compromises hurt more. To get taxes on the table, probably takes something tough such as a one-year freeze on cost-of-living increases in Social Security and other benefits not targeted on the poor. More broadly, to get \$195 billion in new taxes (mostly "sin" taxes and from those with high incomes) probably takes something tough like \$300 billion in spending cuts (half from the military). Rostenkowski's long-shot bet is that a half-trillion dollars in deficit reduction over five years is worth it. For once, this town should stop playing the political angles. It's time to hire a room, close the door and go for it. After all, the same guy who said "read my lips," also said of the voters in his Inaugural Address, "they didn't send us here to bicker." 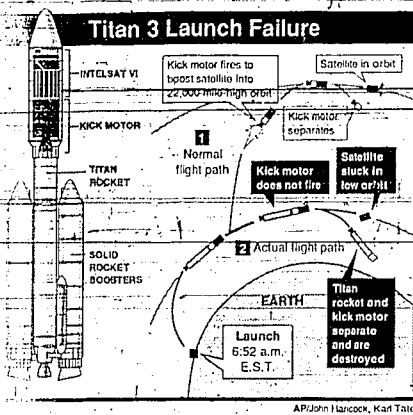
**Supports car dealership**

## Intelsat tries to save stranded satellite

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — An uninsured \$150-million communications satellite stranded in an unusually low orbit appeared to be a loss Thursday as engineers tried desperately to boost it to a higher orbit.

The Intelsat VI satellite has until March 25 in its present orbit before it plunges back through Earth's atmosphere, said Maj. Thomas Neumann of the U.S. Space Command in Colorado.

"We are taking all steps necessary to place the satellite in a stable higher orbit where it could remain indefinitely," said Dean Burch, director general of Intelsat.

However, Neumann said it was not certain whether the satellite could survive more than a few weeks even in a higher orbit.

The 5-ton satellite was propelled into space Wednesday at a cost of about \$270 million in the fourth commercial launch of a payload by a U.S. company.

It wound up in the wrong orbit after failing to separate properly from the second stage of its Titan 3 booster rocket. The satellite was separated about seven hours later by computer commands sent from Intelsat's headquarters in Washington, D.C.

The rocket motor that was to have boosted the satellite into higher orbit remained attached to the second stage booster.

The satellite has small thrusters for maneuvering, which Intelsat was

attempting to use to boost the spacecraft higher.

The Titan's second stage, which was traveling at about the same speed as the satellite in the same orbit, has until about Wednesday before falling back to Earth, Neumann said. The rocket has more mass than the satellite and more surface area, causing greater atmospheric drag, he said.

Chances are the U.S. Space Command will not know where the spacecraft will come down until about 12 hours beforehand, Neumann said.

Intelsat considered various options to save its satellite, including a space shuttle recovery, said Intelsat spokeswoman Sigrid Badinelli. She declined to elaborate on what other options were available.

But National Aeronautics and Space Administration spokesman Karl Krastoffler said a shuttle rescue attempt appeared unlikely.

Intelsat received some signals from the satellite Wednesday, and ground crews were able to execute commands to the spacecraft, Burch said.

Shuttles have brought back two satellites for refurbishing, and crew members have repaired two others in space.

Intelsat's efforts took place before the 1986 Challenger accident, after which President Reagan and Congress directed NASA to move away from the commercial launch

## Electronics store tycoon due in court, vanishes

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) — High-priced ads touting "INSAAAAANE" prices at Crazy Eddie electronics store operated on TV screens from Connecticut to Pennsylvania for two decades, and inspired a "Saturday Night Live" skit.

"Crazy Eddie" was Eddie Antar, a high school dropout who built a 43-store empire from a lone outlet and amassed millions before the chain went broke.

"Now, Antar has become a fugitive from a Securities and Exchange Commission insider trading lawsuit. He does not appear in court Friday, he could face default in the lawsuit and possible monetary penalties.

"I have no expectations at all about seeing him," said a source close to Antar who spoke on condition of anonymity. Authorities speculate that Antar may have fled the country.

"His commercials used to annoy me, and now he's annoying me," said U.S. Marshal Arthur Borinsky, the man in charge of tracking Antar if he will.

Authorities last saw Antar when he showed up for a Feb. 13 court date in connection with the SEC lawsuit.

When the 42-year-old entrepreneur missed a scheduled appearance two weeks later, U.S. District Judge Nicholas H. Politan charged him with criminal contempt.

Politan required Antar to return \$52 million believed to be in Israeli banks to the United States. The money is allegedly illegal profits made from selling Crazy Eddie stock.

Politan froze Antar's assets and appointed a trustee to trace them. The SEC attorney also filed criminal contempt charges against him.

The SEC charges that Antar and other former Crazy Eddie officials reaped millions of dollars in illegal stock trading profits after inflating the company's income. They allegedly exaggerated inventory and falsified financial bills to suppliers.

Antar's wife, former wife, in-laws and friends all say they have no idea where he is.

## Vultures return to roost in Ohio

HICKLEY, Ohio (AP) — With more than 170 years of tradition under their wings, the buzzards returned as scheduled Thursday, lighting buzzard watchers from across the county who had been a staple since before dawn.

According to local folklore, the buzzard hunt began when a small flock of buzzards was seen on March 15, 1819, when frozen ground melted. A Christmas Eve buzzard hunt began defrosting as spring approached.

Ranger Capt. Roger Lutz, the official buzzard spouter, said he saw the first buzzard, or turkey vulture, at 26 a.m. Fifteen had been counted by 3:10 a.m., and more were coming, said Ranger Jan Hoover.

About 150 people, including a dozen wearing buzzard costumes, watched the large black scavengers, who traditionally roost along the rocky ledges of Hickley Lake in the Cleveland Metroparks Reservation.

## Nuclear-waste negotiator: A post with scant appeal

WASHINGTON — How would you like a really important job in the White House — a job that involves politics, the environment, big business and lots of money?

Sounds great. What is it?

Nuclear-waste negotiator.

All you have to do is find a state or an Indian reservation that will volunteer to store tons of highly radioactive waste from nuclear power plants for at least 10 years.

It's such a great job, in fact, and so important, that it has never been filled since Congress created it in 1987.

They say former Utah Gov. Scott Matheson, D, was in line for it, but he turned it down at the last minute, and the White House had to start the search all over again. Recently, though, Energy Secretary James D. Watkins told a Senate committee that the "White House has found a superbly qualified individual" to take on the task. He didn't give a

name, but industry sources said the candidate is David Leroy, former lieutenant governor of Idaho, now a lawyer in Boise.

Leroy declined to comment on his reported selection. If nominated by President Bush and confirmed by the Senate, he will fill a position created at the behest of Rep. Morris K. Udall, D-Ariz., when Congress rewrote the Nuclear Waste Policy Act in 1987.

His assignment will be to find a site for temporary storage of the

nation's mounting pile of civilian nuclear waste. The site, known as a monitored retrievable storage (MRS) facility, would be used until a permanent repository that the Energy Department hopes to create at Yucca Mountain, Nev., is ready. The Yucca Mountain facility cannot open before 2010, Watkins said, even if the Energy Department prevails in a lawsuit against the state, which has refused to grant department scientists the permits they need to begin test excavations at the site.

# U.S. indicts Burma druglord

WASHINGTON (AP) — Attorney General Dick Thornburgh denounced Khun Sa, the opium warlord of Burma, as the "Prince of Death" Thursday in announcing drug-trafficking charges stemming from the largest heroin seizure ever.

It is unlikely, however, that Khun Sa will be brought to trial in the United States in the near future. For years, the Burmese government has been fighting Khun Sa and his thousands of soldiers — to no avail.

Thornburgh refused to concede, however, that the effort to bring Khun Sa to trial would be futile, saying it would "not necessarily require a small war to capture him."

"He may be subject to delivery by his own forces, if someone decides to betray him," said Thornburgh.

Relations between the United States and Burma have been strained since U.S. aid was cut off two years ago following several massacres and the installation of a military government.

Thornburgh said the U.S. and Burmese governments were united in their desire to apprehend Khun Sa. "They are as determined governmentally as we are to deal with the problem," the attorney general said. "This would be an important breakthrough for both them and us."

Thornburgh said he had not consulted with Burma on Khun Sa, but he was hoping to get the cooperation of governments there and in neighboring countries.

# Wyoming 47th state to honor King

CHEYENNE, Wyo. (AP) — Wyoming became the 47th state to honor Martin Luther King Jr.'s ideals Thursday when Gov. Mike Sullivan signed into law legislation creating a state holiday dedicated to equal rights.

Although known as the Equality State, it took years for Wyoming to set aside the third Monday in January in King's honor. Legislative leaders opposed to the holiday questioned whether King should be singled out, noting that many other Americans also fought for civil rights.

Indeed, the legislation Sullivan signed into law

shortly before 1 p.m. creates "Martin Luther King Jr. Wyoming Equality Day."

Before signing the law, the governor urged Wyoming residents to use the occasion to "renew King's ideals and the ideals of the Equality State."

Standing in the Statehouse rotunda beneath a U.S. flag with 44 stars, symbolic of Wyoming's entry to the Union in 1890, the governor asked that everyone affirm our commitment to equality through passage, at long last, of this bill.

Championing the legislation for the past eight years has been Sen. L. B. Byrd, a Cheyenne Democrat who is the Legislature's only black.

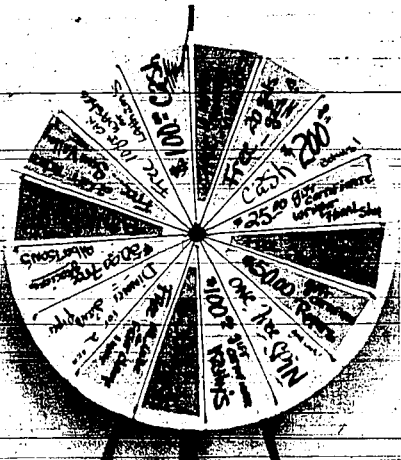

### Survivor of accident in serious condition

TWIN FALLS - A Twin Falls man injured in a car accident on Wednesday was in serious condition Thursday at Magic Valley Regional Medical Center, a spokesman said.

Bruce Thaele, 30, was injured when the pickup he was riding in was broadsided by another, driven by Tami Marie Peterson, 18, of Tiral Tiler. Thursday's Times-News incorrectly stated that Peterson's pickup was broadsided.

Peterson was killed in the accident, which occurred at 9:45 a.m. at the intersection of 400 North and 2600 East. The State Police said she failed to yield a stop sign.

Jeffrey Rulhiser, 30, Twin Falls, the driver of the truck in which Thaele rode, was treated and released from the hospital.

### Cause of death in fall to be determined soon

RUPERT - The exact cause of death of a man who fell while demolishing the old Woolford grain and seed mill should be determined in two weeks.

Sтивен Roy Goodro, 41, of Burley, fell 8 feet 3 inches from scaffolding into an empty grain bin just before 4:51 p.m. Tuesday. Rupert Police Chief Paul Pries said.

An autopsy was done Wednesday on Goodro. Minidoka County Coroner Arvin Hansen said Goodro possibly suffered a heart attack, but that the exact cause of death won't be known until after tests are confirmed from the autopsy.

Goodro was working for a subcontractor for Snake River Seed, Pries said. The seed company owns the property and is having the building demolished, said part-owner Guy Meuleman. Meuleman declined to comment further on the accident.

### Debaters from Magic Valley attend competition in Boise

TWIN FALLS - Debaters from Jerome, Twin Falls, Valley and Wood River will travel to Boise this weekend to take part in state competition.

Other Bruin debaters who have earned trophies this year include Mike Donnelly, Jennifer Seranich, Joanne Williams, Lane Starin and Trevor Dodge. Nick Nicholson is the team's coach.

### Superintendent candidates want their names withheld

TWIN FALLS - The public will not be involved in the School Board's search for a new superintendent - at least not at this stage.

Five of the six semi-final candidates have been contacted, said Board Chairman Calvin Lamborn, but none of them would give the board permission to release their names to the public.

Acting Superintendent Keith Tolzin, however, said Thursday he is one of the six semi-finalists.

Lamborn said the board has not decided what it will do after the field of six is cut down to two or three final candidates. The public might be involved then, he said.

If that happens, the Twin Falls Area Chamber of Commerce Education Committee will be the first to sign up.

The 10-person committee sent a letter to the board Thursday requesting it be involved in the search.

"We just wanted the School Board to know we're tired up," committee chairman Deek Waters said. "We asked to participate and we're very interested. And we think we have some experience and background that could be of use to them."

### Budget committee reserves \$15,000 for Stricker Ranch

BOISE - Stricker Ranch will receive only half of the money needed for repairs, but the Legislature's budget-writing committee did agree Thursday to allocate \$15,000 from the state's 1991 budget to pay for a new trail at the historic site south of Kimberly.

The state historical society requested \$30,000 from the state.

"It was a close one. We were coming out of money," said Sen. Lynn Tominga, R-Rupert, who is a member of the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee. The appropriation must still be approved by the full House and Senate.

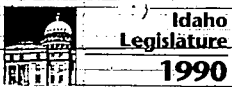
BOISE - The Senate President Pro Tem will assemble an informal committee to investigate accusations of mail tampering involving Sen. John Peavey, D-Carey.

The investigation is in response to a formal complaint by Sen. Larry Anderson, R-Edin, who accuses Peavey of tampering with letters Anderson intended to send to his Magic Valley constituents.

"He's not sure it's a violation of the law or Senate ethics, nor are we," Senate Pro Tem Michael Crapo, R-Idaho Falls, said Thursday.

Nevertheless Crapo called the allegations serious enough to merit an informal investigation by a committee comprised of three Republicans and two Democrats. He would not say who the committee members would be, only that they would not include members of either party's leadership.

The committee will meet within the next few days. If it recommends further action, Crapo said he would refer those recom-



mendations to a standing Senate committee, which could then call for a formal board of inquiry.

"I think we want to handle this quickly," Crapo said.

If Peavey is found to have violated Senate ethics, Crapo said he could possibly be expelled from the body by a two-third vote.

"I think you're going to see people bending over backwards to be entirely fair here," Crapo said.

Peavey does not deny that he handled Anderson's mail over the weekend.

"I would welcome the opportunity to get the facts out because there certainly wasn't any violation of ethics or certainty of Sen. Anderson's mail," he said.

# Longview hires back workers

TWIN FALLS - Twenty retired employees of Fibre Co. workers returned to work Wednesday, after a drop in demand for the company's cardboard boxes led to a short layoff at the Twin Falls plant.

Plant Manager Gene Oliver said he isn't certain what caused the drop in demand.

But one explanation, he said, may be drought-related shortages of potatoes in other parts of the country that prompted out-of-state companies to buy potatoes from Idaho.

About 70 percent of the plant's boxes go to the potato industry, mostly in Idaho.

The cycle started with two years of drought in the Midwest. Potato supplies dropped, prices went up and processors from those areas of the country had to look elsewhere for potatoes.

They came to Idaho, and started competing with the state's processors and fresh-pack companies for Idaho spuds. That, in turn, pushed prices even higher and may have made it harder for in-state processors to get enough potatoes.

And it may have cut in-state supplies enough to temporarily cut back orders for Longview's product.

"Two weeks was all there was of it,"

# Perjury trial focuses on location alibi

TWIN FALLS - In the first perjury case filed by her office, Twin Falls County Prosecutor K. Ellen Baxter testified Thursday that a man on trial last spring for lewd conduct said under oath he was out of state when the alleged sexual crime occurred.

Baxter said her office learned after the trial that Paul Eugene McBride, 28, Jerome, had been in the Payette County Jail for four days.

Acquitted at the May 1989 trial of two lewd and lascivious conduct charges, McBride is on trial this week on a charge of perjury. The state charges McBride falsely testified he was out of state from July 1 to Sept. 1, 1986, when he was actually in the Payette jail July 4 to 8.

The alleged lewd conduct occurred sometime between July 4 and Sept. 1, 1986.

Defense attorney Tom Kershaw told the

eight female and four male jurors in his opening argument that he would not contest that McBride said he was out of state.

"Though he did make a mistake, it wasn't a willful or knowing one," said Kershaw, who added that willful intent must be proved by Special Prosecutor J. Scott James of Blaine County.

James took over the case, filed by Baxter, because she would be called a witness.

Kershaw also argued that the false statement was not material to the original trial, which also must be shown to prove perjury.

"If he was in Twin Falls, he couldn't have committed the crime, whether he was in Payette, Texas or Timbuktu," Kershaw said.

In other testimony from an Idaho State Police trooper and by a jailer from Payette who described McBride's arrest and incarceration there July 4 to 8, Baxter took the stand.

She said that while preparing for the lewd conduct trial, she was not told by

BOISE - The Idaho Senate on Thursday approved a bill allowing the state Fish and Game Commission to create or enhance a trophy fishery.

The legislation included that provision that rules excluding bait fishermen or other groups must be based on evidence showing the exclusion is necessary.

The bill, sponsored by Sen. John Peavey, D-Carey, is one of several pieces of legislation proposed after the Idaho Sportsmen's Association and the Fish and Game Commission tangled over fishing restrictions on portions of the Big Wood River and Silver Creek.

Senate Resources and Environment Committee chairman Earl Sols said the language in the bill was agreed to by Keith Roark, the lawyer for the Sportsmen's group, and the Idaho Department of Fish and Game attorney.

The Kimberly Republican said the bill introduces "strange language" about what the current law states. It might offer protection to bait fishermen and others in situations where restrictions are being considered, he said.

But Sen. Larry Anderson, R-Edin, was unconvinced. During floor debate, Anderson said the measure was "pretty much like throwing a bone to a dog."

"As far as throwing a bone to a dog, it has a little meat on it sometimes it's a good thing to do," Peavey said.

The bill passed 23 to 16. Sols and Peavey voted in favor of the measure. Anderson, Sen. Denton Damington, R-DeWalt, and Sen. Lynn Tominga, R-Rupert, voted against the bill. Sen. Joyce McRoberts, R-Twin Falls, was absent and excused.

The measure will now go before the House.

# Bliss school contract talks in works

BLISS - Teachers here and School Board members are scheduled to meet next month to work out some ground rules for this year's contract negotiations.

Representatives of the Bliss Education Association, special education teacher Angie Eames and fourth-grade teacher Bessy Pugmire, told the board Tuesday "good faith" negotiations will require "some sort of agreement" between the board and the association before annual contract talks begin in April.

"We don't have anything formal," Eames said. "The superintendent has some language we have some language, but nothing formal yet."

The idea for a procedural contract came from comments at a recent negotiating seminar by Fifth District Judge Daniel Hurlbutt, according to Eames and Pugmire.

"He was very neutral," Eames said. "Am just told us how he would rule in certain

contract situations.

Bliss Superintendent Wendell Anderson also attended the seminar and he urged other board members to attend another seminar yet to be scheduled before the end of the school year.

In other matters, six students from Bliss filed a lawsuit with the Business Education Conference last month. Bliss and teacher Robert Santi asked the board for financial help so the students can attend the national competition April 27-May 1 in Minneapolis, Minn.

"If we've got any money to help them, we'll try to help," School Board Chairman Larry Graves said.

"If you have a group of kids who have worked as hard as these kids have, it would be a shame if they couldn't go, because there wasn't enough money," Anderson added.

The team representing Bliss won second place in the Parliamentary procedure category. The students are Karma Wood, Amber Felton, Rochelle Owsley, Tammy

Owsley, Sean Wood and Heidi Brendorf. Santi estimates each student will need about \$200 to attend the conference. He said he is "desperate" for the money, since the conference is only a couple of weeks away.

The students could reply the district through fund-raising if the district won't put up the money in advance.

He also asked for donations. In other business, the board discussed the financial feasibility of paving the school parking lot. Graves suggested asking the Bliss Highway District for any leftover paving material it might have that could be sold to the school at a reduced price.

"Personally, I'd like to see them pave it," Graves said. "It'll create it will cost big bucks."

City Superintendent Bill Hargis said city crews have been making pre-season checks of the irrigation lines. He also submitted a proposal to seal coat 23 blocks of city streets and to scrub 21 blocks. The city will also construct a new road near the miniature golf course on 16th.

Councilwoman Bessie Hurless

was scheduled to plant an Arbor Day ceremony with the school to plant a tree in the park. The city will provide the tree.

## Storage tank fund wins legislative OK

BOISE (AP) — Creation of a special fund, financed by fuel wholesalers, to help Idaho owners of underground storage tanks meet new federal insurance guidelines has won final legislative approval.

"It's imperative that we do something about this now," Senate Democratic Floor Leader Bruce Sweeney of Lewiston told his colleagues Thursday in gaining unanimous support for the plan.

"We've got a mechanism that will work," Sweeney said of the scheme developed by a special legislative task force last year.

Sent to the governor with little debate, the bill creates the Idaho Petroleum Clean Water Trust Fund in response to fears of many underground storage tank owners that compliance with the new Environmental Protection Agency regulations will drive them out of business.

These regulations require storage tank owners to get a minimum \$1 million in liability insurance cover-

age against environmental damage from leaking underground tanks. The regulations also require leak tanks to be removed or fixed and monitoring devices to be installed in certain cases.

The rules begin phased in late December and should be in full effect by the end of the decade.

Critics, who have won a minor delay in the compliance schedule for owners of just a few tanks, warned that the regulations are so oppressive they will force many gasoline retailers out of business, leaving long stretches of rural highway without fuel supplies.

The insurance fund will receive a \$1 million loan from taxpayers to get started, but that money will be repaid within 18 months. By then, the insurance program should be supported by fee-imposed on fuel wholesalers when they get the product out of the pipeline.

While that cost will eventually be passed on to consumers, lawmakers made no mention of that impact.

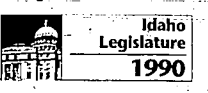
## Activists rally in advance of abortion vote

BOISE (AP) — Hundreds of pro-choice advocates rallied at the Idaho Capitol in anticipation of Friday's Senate committee vote on House-passed legislation giving the state the nation's toughest anti-abortion law.

Telephone calls and mail were pouring into the Capitol from both camps on Thursday. Lawmakers said contacts were beginning to turn into anti-abortion forces fought to hold the majority they believe they have for the bill and pro-choice advocates hoped to capitalize on lingering doubts about the measure's constitutionality.

"It's such a gut-wrenching issue," said Sen. Denton Dunnington, R-DeLo, an abortion opponent. "I've never seen an issue where the letters are as mean as they are — from both sides."

After clearing the House by 111 votes last week, the bill is an abortion as a midday of birth control became the target of second thoughts



by its sponsors. They were concerned about claims of respected legal scholars that it might be so restrictive it would not withstand a court challenge.

The bill allows abortion only in the cases of nonviability, rape reported within seven days, incest when the victim is under 18 years old, severe fetal deformity and a threat to the life or physical health of the mother. Similar measures have been rejected by other states, including Utah, as too restrictive.

National Right To Life officials continued to defend the validity of the bill they hope will test the limits of the U.S. Supreme Court's recent abortion decisions. But the Senate State Affairs Committee decided to obtain more expert legal advice before deciding the bill's fate on Friday.

## Senate ratifies new approach to residential care

BOISE (AP) — In a bid to offset skyrocketing long-term health care costs, the Idaho Senate has given final approval to legislation revamping state regulation of residential care facilities with a view to encouraging their expansion.

"This industry is extremely important and we're going to keep the cost of health care down," Senate Health and Welfare Chairman Larry Anderson, R-Twin Falls, said.

Without a single opposing vote, the chamber sent the bill to Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus on Thursday. It follows the recommendations

of a special task force formed by lawmakers last year to study the shelter care industry that provides help for the mentally ill, elderly and developmentally or physically disabled.

Aimed at the neediest and most helpless of society, the reform package calls for a more development of humane, safe, and homelike living conditions for those under shelter care, which is substantially less expensive than institutionalization.

The plan sets out minimum qualifications for shelter care operators and staff, a bill of rights for residents

and penalties for noncompliance, all effective in January. Currently the state only has the option of shutting down shelter care operations if funds to be substandard, often leaving the residents with no alternative living arrangements.

Civil penalties would be allowed against homes failing to meet state standards with the money going into a trust fund that would be used to help residents of homes the state finds deficient.

The only concern expressed over the regulatory revisions was their possible application to families tak-

ing care of elderly parents, but supporters provided assurances those cases would not be included in any state regulation.

The major problem with the bill is the \$1.5-million price tag it carries for new inspectors and increased reimbursements to shelter home operators for training.

That only adds to the red ink that has been leaking from the 1991 general tax budget for state operations, increasing the amount of money lawmakers will eventually have to siphon from a \$50 million reserve account to avoid a deficit.

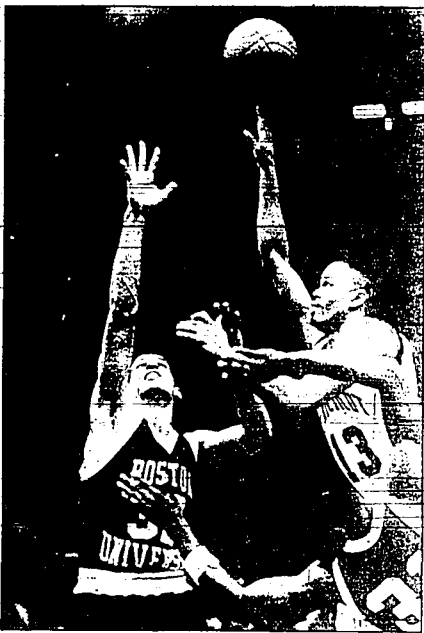

—WINTER HAVEN, Fla. (AP) — Wade Boggs has had 200 or more hits in seven straight seasons, one short of Wee Willie Keeler's record. The lockout could cost Boggs a chance to tie it.

—"Whatever happens, happens," Boggs said Thursday. "I believe everything in life has a purpose. If the streak ends, or something like that, there's nothing you can do about."

—In 1981 Pete Rose's pursuit of Ty Cobb was slowed by the 50-day strike, and Nolan Ryan's attempt for 300 wins will be slowed by this year's lockout. If a significant number of games are lost, Boggs' chance to tie Keeler will be gone forever.

—"It's the luck of the draw," the Boston third baseman said. "We're not enjoying this, we'd like to get back to work. As for myself, I've just been trying to get ready."

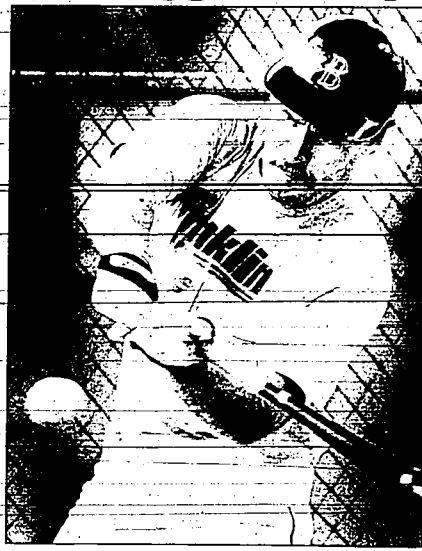
—Boggs, who at age 31 has 1,597 hits, broke one of Lou Gehrig's records last year when he got 200 hits and 100 walks for the fourth consecutive year. But he still needs another 200-hit season to tie Keeler's record of eight in a row, set from 1894 to 1901.

—Every year, Boggs raps out hit after hit. But you can't hit when they're no games.

—"I really haven't thought of the long-term ramifications from what's happening," Boggs said.

—One year ago, he was the center of a storm as details of his affair with Margie Adams became public. She threatened to force Boggs' teammates to testify, and Boston general manager talked to other teams about possible trades for Boggs.

—Now, his off-field life is settled, and he has a new three-year contract for \$7.3 million. The only

question is when he and other players will be back on the field.

—"I was ready to go last year," he said, "and I'll be ready this year."

—Boggs slumped — for him, anyway — to .350 last season. His lifetime average dropped four points to .352, but he remains fourth on the all-time list — trailing Ty Cobb, Rogers Hornsby and Shoeless Joe Jackson.

—Boggs went 17-for-38 in his last nine games to finish with 205 hits, but Kirby Puckett of the Minnesota Twins hit .339, ending Boggs' run of 10 consecutive batting championships.

—"I just didn't do it last season," Boggs said. "I would like to have been at .350 or .360, but I had too many ups and downs."

—Roger Clemens was booed at Boston's home opener last year after criticizing fans. Boggs, despite the controversy — or perhaps because of it — was given a standing ovation.

—He hit .419 in the first 10 games, then reverted to early season form. His worst month is April, with a career average of .293. His slump continued into May and his average reached a low of .288 on May 23.

—"I think many of my early problems are due to the fact that April is colder than any other month and I'm not a very good cold weather player," he said. "But last year I picked up a couple of bad habits. I finally corrected them and did better, but I could have done a lot better."

—Boggs led the league for the last time in 1981 on Aug. 29. He fell out of the race with 0-for-16 and 2-for-27 punts, finishing third behind Puckett and Carney Lansford of Oakland.

# Miami willing to trade Marino for better team

—MIAMI (AP) — The Miami Dolphins are in no hurry to trade Dan Marino. But coach Don Shula says he'd deal his star quarterback if it would improve the team.

—Shula confirmed Thursday that he and Marino have discussed the possibility of a trade. But Shula and other club officials also deemed that they are under way.

—"We're not seeking a trade," Shula said in Orlando, site of the NFL owners' meeting. "He's frustrated just like I am at not being in the playoffs the last four years."

—"If I felt I could make a trade that would help our team, Dan or anyone else would be traded," Shula said. "But I am not actively seeking a trade."

—Marino, vacationing in Colorado, confirmed through a team spokesman in Miami that he and Shula had talked, but he didn't say they discussed a trade.

—"Coach Shula and I talked after the season ended about a lot of different things concerning the team, both good and bad, including my role with the Dolphins," he said in a statement. He said the talks "were private and will continue to remain that way."

—Marino had his poorest full season in 1989 as the Dolphins finished 8-3. But in the strike-shortened season, Marino threw for 3,819 yards, 35 touchdowns and 17 interceptions. He completed the fewest passes (550), completed the fewest (308) for his lowest average (56.6 percent) and yardage (3,997). By comparison, he completed 362 passes, or 64.2 percent, for 3,054

yards in 1984 when the Dolphins were American Conference champs.

—The Philadelphia Daily News on Wednesday quoted league sources as saying Marino, 28, has asked to be traded Pittsburgh, Chicago, Indianapolis or the Los Angeles Raiders.

—But club President Tim Robbie, also in Orlando for the NFL meetings, said the subject of a trade has not come up with any other team.

—"We've had no discussions with any club about trading Dan Marino and that's really all I want to say about that," he said Wednesday.

—Marino's agent, Marvin Demoff, did not return messages at an a telephone number in Jacksonville Thursday at his Los Angeles office. But in an interview Wednesday with the Miami Herald, he did not deny that Marino wants to play somewhere else this fall.

—"In deference to Tim Robbie, it's only proper I don't comment — but that should not be interpreted one way or another," he said.

—He also said he had no comment on whether Marino might want to renegotiate his contract.

—The Herald, quoting sources close to Marino, said Thursday that Marino is using talk of seeking a trade as a lever for renegotiation.

—"What is Dan now, the fifth- or sixth-best paid quarterback?" he wants to move up, the source said. "He wouldn't object to a raise. But he's looking at this new TV deal, and I think he wants a little something."

—HOUSTON (AP) — Heisman Trophy winner Andre Ware plans to announce Friday if he will be available for the NFL draft and if he is, the Houston Oilers may be interested.

—Houston Oilers coach Jack Pardee, Ware's coach at the University of Houston last season, said he would consider taking his former quarterback.

—"We'd have to look at the best athlete available and I think Ware is Andre just might be the best athlete there," Pardee said. "If he comes out, I can't picture him being around when we draft (15th)."

—"But if he is there, it certainly would have to take some thought, at least."

—Ware told the Houston Chronicle in a story published Thursday that he was "strongly" determined but had not yet made up his mind.

—On Wednesday, the Houston Post, citing unidentified sources, said Ware had decided to seek the NFL's riches rather than return to the oil business this season.

—Only Carlton is the Oilers' backup quarterback to Pro Football star Warren Moon. But Carlton has asked to be traded because he wants a chance to start.

—"It was kind of funny, because it the report was something I didn't expect," Ware said. "I plan to make my announcement at a news conference Friday and it was kind of funny to read about it."

—"This is going to be a safe decision," he added. "I'm tired of

—Ware has been participating in the Oilers' spring drills and was scheduled to practice Wednesday, but Benjamins canceled the workout because of weather.

—Ware obtained a Lloyd's of London insurance policy before beginning spring drills that would protect him against a career-ending injury should he remain in college for his senior year.

—Ware's meeting this week in Orlando, Fla., will discuss an entry-level wage scale.

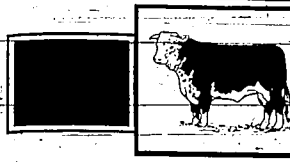

Today my readers get a shot at winning the 1989 Spingold-Team Championship. Cover all but the West cards and the bidding, and choose your lead—against the six-card slam.

My team was leading by a scant four IMPs when my teammates bid aggressively to this slam. Luckily for us, our opponents did not find the lead to beat it. Had West done so, we would have lost the championship by seven IMPs instead of winning by six IMPs. Did you find the lead to beat it?

As you can see, only a diamond lead succeeds. At the table, a third defender (it was a grueling schedule) led a spade, and Mike Passell of Dallas had no trouble making the slam.

The story of this championship was told in the popular magazine "Bridge Today" (six issues a year, 18 Village View Blvd., Ballston Lake, NY 12019); it includes an interview with the unfortunate West, who chose the dull spade lead. He said: "I was tired, but twice partner didn't double for a spade lead. Had I led a club, I could have forgiven my self (two club winners are more likely than two diamond winners). However, my actual spade play will remain a living nightmare."

By the late '70s, Dr. Hook had moved to the disco craze with "When You're in Love with a Beautiful Woman" and "Sexy Eyes." Then, the band brought in the MTV era with "Baby Makes Her Blue Jeans Talk." Soon after, it was curtains for the band.

But Sawyer — the eye-patched lead singer — continues to perform, playing in such diverse venues as Jackson's Coctus Pete's (where he'll be tonight through Sunday) and Ketchum's Whiskey Jacques' (where he'll hold forth Monday).

Tickets for the Coctus Pete's shows at 8 p.m. and 11 p.m. are \$7.50, \$10 and \$12.50. Saturday's shows are sold out, but seats should remain for the performances tonight and Sunday.

Dr. Hook will take the stage at

Whiskey Jacques' about 9:30 p.m. Monday. Cover will be \$10. The bar is at 206 N. Main St. in Ketchum.

Still using the name Dr. Hook, Sawyer called this week from Lake Village, an Arkansas hamlet where he and his new band were playing before heading west. Sawyer, now 53, said he's also wrapping up an album, his first in years.

"We're back in the studio," he

said. "We were in Australia" last November and I had this song I wanted to cut, and it turned out really well."

"I finished it up in Memphis, then I went to New Orleans and cut some other tracks. I've got some real good stuff happening," he said.

Sawyer added that he's not sure when the new disc will be out, but he says several major labels are interested.

In its heyday, Dr. Hook was one of rock's most irrevocable bands. "We were just having fun of everything and having a good time with it," said Sawyer.

Several of the band's hits were written by Shel Silverstein, a cartoonist-turned-writer who also penned "A Boy Named Sue" and "The Unicorn."

"It's very hard to come across that kind of material," said Sawyer. "There's not that many real intelligent, witty writers."

Nevertheless, he added he has a couple songs in mind for recording that would carry on the Dr. Hook tradition.

Sawyer said he thinks horns are going to be big in the next few years, and he predicts that an annual "Funky" show, a fun type show, he said. "Always has been."

blues — similar to that heard in Elvis Presley's early days — will be making a comeback on the charts.

Despite keeping a fairly low profile for the past few years, Sawyer said he's been keeping busy.

degree of professionalism, even Tom has first-time actors.

NEW YORK (AP) — "Are you going to die?" asks Charlie Brown when Janice, his little friend in the hospital bed, says she has leukemia.

"Good grief, Charlie Brown!" cries Linus. "What kind of question is that?"

A blunt one, asked in a different kind of "Peanuts" special that CBS is showing tonight. Rest-assured, though, that the ending is upbeat, in keeping with medical fact and the nature of Charles M. Schulz.

Schulz, who has drawn the wise and whimsical characters of his "Peanuts" cartoon strip since 1950 and did his first TV special in 1965, hadn't thought of making his next one about a child who develops leukemia.

What became today's "Why, Charlie Brown, Why?" began, he says, with an idea from Sylvia Cook, a nurse in California who works with young cancer patients, at

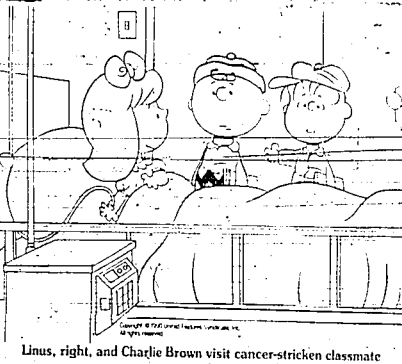
Stanford Children's Hospital.

She proposed a five-minute film for them in which cancer and its treatment were explained by the "Peanuts" gang. "Gradually, her idea changed, and she finally decided that it'd be more important if we could do a film that would show the people around the person who was ill just what it would be," he says.

With the aid of the American Cancer Society, that's ultimately what happened. It helped that Schulz came to believe the film would make a good "Peanuts" special for TV and shouldn't be limited to hospital showings.

The survival rate for children is high, according to ACS spokesman David Lehman. He says the society estimates 2,500 children will be stricken with leukemia this year, 1,000 of them with its acute form.

However, 71 percent are expected to survive, he says.

# Innocent gets drawn in over his head in thrilling 'Bad Influence'

HOLLYWOOD — What would be the ultimate enticement for a bright, fast-track yuppie today? If he's "Bad Influence's" socially hesitant Michael Boll (James Spader), it would be cool. The rest, in triplicate. The enameled francophile, a rich daddy's girl who will program him for success relentlessly. A crack at the senior marketing analyst's job at his brokerage. A fancy apartment just waiting to be done by Metropolitan Home.

But at a trendy Los Angeles bar, women are more likely to gaze past Michael than look places with him. And he could probably graph the rest of his life right now, before he's 30, and not be off by more than one mid-life love affair.

Then a bar accident drops Alex (Rob Lowe) into Michael's care fully managed life and the lid comes off.

### Review

Actually, R-rated "Bad Influence" is the rattlingly fine psychological thriller that it is because director Curtis Hanson and writer David Kopp have kept their "what if's" so close to the bone.

Everyone has known an Alex, or covertly watched one in action. Man or woman, rich or not-yet rich, an Alex is born knowing, born arrogant, a born insider.

Lowe's assumed French and Italian accents may be pretty funny, but he's caught the charm, the insinuation and the menace of the guy dead on, and the sneering fury of his last exchange comes from a Lowe we haven't seen before.

Make no mistake, though; it is Spader's character who must struggle through the mounting

terrors unleashed when he lets this cool stranger into his life.

Michael first tests Alex's hard-ball suggestion for beating his office rival at his own smarmy game. When that succeeds — triumphantly — he follows in Alex's wake for a night on the town, letting the old

hand lose him the intriguing Claire (Lisa Zane, simply fine), who seems Alex's match in chic rootlessness. After that, the hooks are set, with horrifying and finally deadly results.

For all this, we should celebrate cinematographer Robert Elswit, costume designer Malissa Daniels, editor Bonnie Kochler, production designer Ron Foreman and the music of Trevor Jones.

As we all know, there really is nothing new on the screen, because the only truly fitting title for "Bad Influence" is "sex, lies and videotape."

## 'Red October' top movie

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — "The Hunt for Red October" continued to steam past the box-office competition over the weekend, while the acclaimed independent comedy "House Party" opened to robust business in a limited release.

"Red October," the Sean Connery-Alec Baldwin submarine thriller, collected \$14.1 million to remain in first place in the nation's theaters, according to figures released by Exhibitor Relations Co.

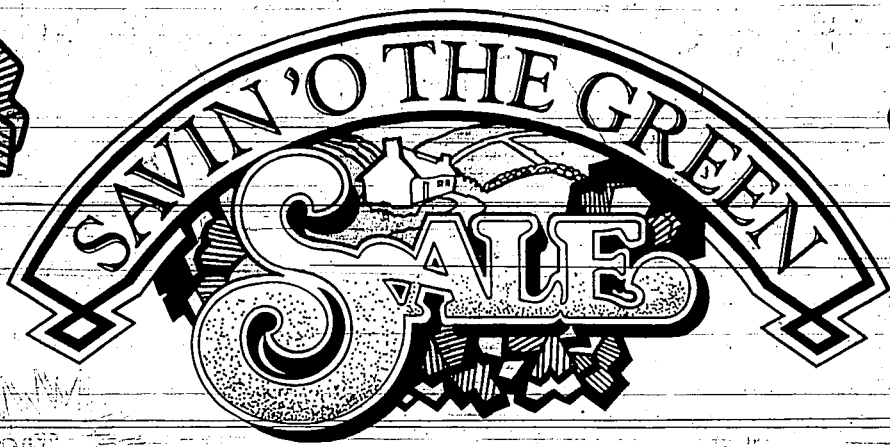

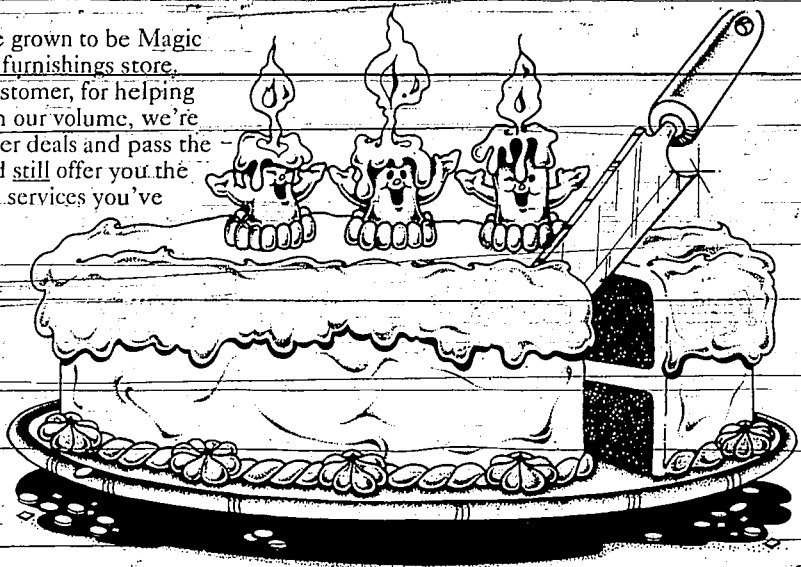

# Trial begins in suit over climbing deaths

PORTLAND (AP) — A lawsuit over a Mount Hood climbing tragedy that killed nine persons in 1986 reached a Portland courtroom Wednesday.

Richard Haeder, father of one of the victims, is suing the Oregon Episcopal School and a part-time assistant, Ralph Summers.

Haeder alleges the defendants acted negligently in planning and carrying out the climb that led to the freezing deaths of seven students and two adults in May 1986.

"This was a school adventure that ended in needless death," said Paul S. Luviera, a Mount Vernon, Wash., lawyer representing Haeder, at the start of the case.

Defense attorney Mark H. Wagner said the climbers were victims of a sudden and vicious storm. He said heroic efforts by Summers prevented two other teenagers from dying.

Haeder's lawsuit alleging the wrongful death of his son, Richard L. Haeder Jr., 16, seeks up to \$800,000 in economic losses to the youth's estate, plus unspecified damages for the boy's pain and suffering and for loss of companionship to the father.

Luviera said the elder Haeder suffered "total devastation" from the death.

The Multnomah County Circuit Court trial is expected to last about a month.

Witnesses are expected to include participants in the climb as well as world-recognized experts in mountain climbing and weather forecasting.

Besides the seven students who died, the victims were the Rev. Thomas Goman, leader of the climb, and Marion Dorwell, dean of students at the private Portland school.

The lawsuit lists more than three

dozen instances of alleged negligence by the school and Summers in planning and carrying out the trip.

Luviera said evidence would show that Goman and Summers considered turning back at least once more finally good so.

Witnesses, however, said Goman and Summers started back down quickly after the onset of the storm.

Summers built a small snow cave for the climbers at the end of the first day of the climb. He and a second climber descended to get help the next day. Three victims were discovered a day later, and the others later, along with the two survivors.

Luviera said Summers failed to mark the snow cave when he left and got lost on his way down. Wagner said the storm was so severe that members of an Air Force rescue unit also got lost.

Luviera said the school's climbers had inadequate tools and equipment for bad weather and that some participants were not in good enough physical condition to make the climb. He said Goman had expressed concerns about the numbers and condition of climbers in the school's Basecamp wilderness education program for several years but that school administrators had not paid heed.

"The school is not perfect and does not think it is perfect," Wagner said. But he said neither Goman nor Summers, who was paid \$500 to help as a consultant, acted unreasonably under the circumstances.

The lawsuit by Haeder, a former Portland lawyer, is the only one of four filed after the tragedy to come to trial. Parents of five student victims settled with the school for undisclosed amounts without filing lawsuits.

**Lotto America prize hits \$14 million**

**Ice-accident victim in critical condition**  
SPOKANE (AP) — A 7-year-old boy who fell through ice in Idaho and spent about 20 minutes in the Spokane River remained in critical condition at Deaconess Medical Center Thursday, 11 days after the accident, a hospital spokeswoman said.

Eance J. Morehouse was taken by Heartline helicopter to the Spokane hospital after a volunteer diver with the Kootenai County, Idaho, sheriff's office pulled him from the water.

Morehouse and three other boys were playing on the ice at a city park in Post Falls, Idaho, when the surface gave way. One child was able to pull himself from the water and the two others were rescued by adults at the scene.

Nursing supervisor Anne Chamberlin said Morehouse's condition has not changed since he was admitted March 4.

**Body identified as missing Boise man**  
BOISE (AP) — Dental records have positively identified the body found near Pendleton, Ore., last week as that of a 70-year-old Boise man.

Oregon State Forensic Pathologist Harry Lewman said the man found dead of multiple stab wounds on the Umatilla Indian Reservation is Delbert Koll. Boise police said Koll was apparently abducted from his home Feb. 27.

Koll was found lying in an irrigation ditch, his hands bound behind his back with a white plastic bag.

Autopsies said Koll had been dead for one to two months before discovery.

Koll was last seen driving his 1980 beige Chevrolet Caprice sedan from an alley near his home near 19th and State streets Feb. 2. Police saw three unidentified passengers were with him. Police found blood and evidence of a search in his home.

**Ex-chief's wife faces 2 drug charges**  
SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — The wife of the former Wendover, Utah, police chief faces a preliminary hearing later this month on two second-degree felony counts of distributing cocaine and methamphetamine.

Janece Carter, 29, appeared Thursday for a hearing before 3rd Circuit Judge Philip Palmer, who set the hearing date for March 29. She is a former Wendover evidence clerk and reserve police officer.

Prosecutors allege that Carter, wife of former Chief A. June Carter, sold six ounces of cocaine and four ounces of methamphetamine for \$16,000 to a confidential informant outside the Crossroads Mall in Salt Lake City on Feb. 27.

Carter, 35, was charged with one count of cocaine possession. Later, at a special meeting, the five-member council unanimously voted to fire him. He faces a preliminary hearing March 30 in Tropic, Utah.

Salt Lake and Wendover, which straddle the Utah-Nevada border about 400 miles west of Salt Lake City, both are within the 3rd Judicial District.

Dan Charbonneau, a Bureau of Narcotics spokesman, said three people who were detained after the blast at the building, which he said had been under surveillance for several days.

This morning, officers still were at the scene of the blast, which occurred at 2 P.M. at the intersection of Fairview Avenue and Choverda Road. Charbonneau said the blast occurred at a small building just west of Choverda on Fairview.

## Brazil's 1st popularly elected leader in 30 years takes oath

BRASILIA, Brazil (AP) — Fernando Collor de Mello took office Thursday as Brazil's first popularly elected president in 29 years.

The promised free-market style reforms and an uncompromising stand on record inflation.

"The most important target of my first year in office is not to tame inflation, but to liquidate it," the conservative new president said. He spoke for about 45 minutes to Brazilian political leaders and foreign dignitaries representing 121 countries.

Among the 27 heads of state at government at the ceremony were presidents Daniel Ortega of Nicaragua and Cuba's Fidel Castro, dressed in a military uniform and wearing the Vatican's ensignia.

Vice President Dan Quayle represented the United States.

After taking the oath as Brazil's 35th president, Collor de Mello spoke at the National Congress and promised to open the economy to world markets. He said Brazil must do away with "colonial prejudices against foreign capital."

He promised social reform to benefit the poor majority of Brazil's 150 million people, saying, "We cannot modernize without social justice or progress without everyone participating."

He also pledged greater political liberties for Brazil, which has lived much of its 101-year period of post-independence under dictatorships.

"My first commitment... is to democracy," Collor de Mello said.

After the ceremony, Collor de Mello, 40, rode along the splendor of ministers to the presidential palace in a black 1953 Rolls-Royce convertible, a gift from England's Queen Elizabeth II. He was accompanied by a white-uniformed color guard on white horses.

Thousands of people packed the laws along the concourse, cheering and waving flags in the green and yellow frontal colors. Banners proclaimed "A New Brazil."

At the presidential palace, Collor de Mello strode up the white marble ramp to meet outgoing President Jose Sarney. Sarney removed the green and yellow presidential sash from his shoulder and placed it on the new president.

The two men, bitter political foes, appeared slightly ill at ease during the brief ceremony and exchanged nervous smiles.

Sarney took office in 1985 following an Electoral College vote set up by a departing 21-year military regime. Collor de Mello's inauguration was the final step in the transition to full democracy in Brazil, South America's largest country. The last popularly elected president was Jânio Quadros in 1961.

On a marble speaking platform outside, Collor de Mello made an emotional first-waving speech to the cheering crowd below.

The two men, bitter political foes, appeared slightly ill at ease during the brief ceremony and exchanged nervous smiles.

Sarney took office in 1985 following an Electoral College vote set up by a departing 21-year military regime. Collor de Mello's inauguration was the final step in the transition to full democracy in Brazil, South America's largest country. The last popularly elected president was Jânio Quadros in 1961.

"I will give my health and my life, if necessary, to ensure that our program is rigorously carried out," he said.

When he finished, thousands of balloons in different colors were released. A band played the Brazilian national anthem. Among those in the crowd was a group of Kayapo Indians, in feathers and tribal paint.

Three left-wing parties boycotted the inauguration to protest Collor de Mello's plan to sell state firms and fire public employees in an effort to slash a \$31 billion budget deficit.

The socialist Workers' Party, whose candidate Luis Inacio Lula da Silva narrowly lost to Collor de Mello in a run-off in December, said it would form a "parallel government" Friday to "monitor" the new administration.

Collor de Mello got off to a fast start, immediately signing into law decrees that:

- Reduce the number of government ministries from 25 to 12.
- Cut government expenses by eliminating ministerial mansions, restricting foreign travel by government officials, and cutting official perks.
- Prevent federal employees from holding more than one job.

A key campaign promise was to crack down on so-called "matarajás," federal employees who earn thousands of dollars a month while rarely showing up for work.

The new president has created a groundswell of popular support with his promises of change. A public opinion poll published in the prominent Folha de Sao Paulo newspaper Thursday showed 71 percent of respondents think he will have a good or excellent administration.

But Collor de Mello, who on Friday is scheduled to announce a full package of free-market style reforms designed to revamp Brazil's battered economy, will face a host of obstacles.

Brazil has a \$350-billion gross national product, eighth largest in the world, but inflation has soared by 2,700 percent in the past 12 months, exacerbating already severe social inequalities.

The country is also handicapped by a \$114 billion foreign debt, largest in the Third World, and is behind on \$6.5 billion in interest payments to private banks and international lenders.

## Quayle giving up Paraguay's gift of 2 jaguar cubs

BRASILIA, Brazil (AP) — Vice President Dan Quayle found himself in a bit of a diplomatic pickle when the president of Paraguay gave him a pair of cuddly jaguar cubs — members of an endangered species.

It was decided that diplomatic protocol required Quayle to accept the cubs, which he was given while visiting Asuncion on Monday, and then try to give them to a zoo, said a Quayle aide speaking only on condition of anonymity.

"We learned about them three days before the trip started. We tried to discourage it. We were told the president had his heart set on it," the aide told reporters.

But the National Zoo in Washington wouldn't take the jaguars because of their endangered species status, and an environmental group called Quayle's office to protest their being taken from the wild.

So on Thursday, at the presidential inauguration in Brasilia, Quayle sent Assistant Secretary of State Bernard Aronson to give the bad news to Paraguayan President Andres Rodriguez.

Aronson told the Paraguayan that Quayle "would prefer that the jaguars be released into the wilds of Paraguay to benefit future generations of Paraguayans," the aide said.

## Gorbachev establishes power in new post, faces frustration

MOSCOW — Mikhail S. Gorbachev has moved his base of power from the Communist Party that has ruled the Soviet Union for seven decades to the government, which until now has played a subordinate role in setting policy.

The prescribed schedule holds, the Soviet people will for the first time elect their own leader in 1995. For the time being, however, Gorbachev will serve as the president elected by the Congress of People's Deputies, the country's representative parliament.

The new post gives the Soviet president — at least on paper — powers akin to those of the president of the United States. It also sets similar limits, such as reserving for the legislature the right to make laws and control the government's purse strings.

While enjoying his new executive authority, Gorbachev may soon learn the frustrations of trying to push his economic program through a legislature less willing than he is to take radical action.

The Supreme Soviet already has shown its reluctance to enact reforms designed to phase in a market economy.

Although Gorbachev faces no serious challenger at the moment, the election results announced Thursday indicated there has been considerable erosion of his support. Gorbachev polled only 59.2 percent of the parliament's votes, and he was the only candidate.

Nearly 500 of the 2,245 members of the Congress voted against Gorbachev, and more than 400 abstained. This suggests a considerable silent opposition to the new president, perhaps strong enough to stymie many of his proposed reforms.

With the new separation of powers, Gorbachev will no longer preside over the Congress of People's Deputies and its legislature, the Supreme Soviet.

The new legislature carries with it the power to propose legislation, negotiate treaties, veto bills and decisions of the Council of Ministers, appoint a Cabinet, declare war if the country is attacked, and under certain conditions impose presidential rule. This means bypassing or overruling the local government to impose direct rule in a certain area of the country.

In a move to mollify opponents who claimed he was seeking to reestablish a dictatorship, Gorbachev gave up some of the emergency powers he had sought. But the new president still will be a formidable figure.

At the same time, the Congress abolished the Communist Party's official monopoly on power and agreed to permit the growth of a multiparty democracy.

That combined with the drubbing many party leaders have suffered at the polls in competitive elections, may lead eventually to the dismantling of the widespread party bureaucracy.

Real power remained with the party, its Central Committee of a few hundred of the Communist elite; the handful of top leaders in the Moscow-based Politburo; and Gorbachev himself.

## Peres says end of government creates 'momentum for peace'

JERUSALEM (AP) — Labor leader Shimon Peres on Thursday won a parliamentary vote to topple Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir's hard-line government and said he had created "momentum toward peace."

"Parliament has shown that there is a majority for peace," said Peres, who is likely to be picked to form a new government. "I believe we can form a government that will reach a dialogue with the Palestinians."

Despite Peres' pledge to move forward, there is little hope for a quick end to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, as long as Israel is constrained by internal politics. Putting together a new coalition government is a daunting assignment that is certain to take weeks if not months.

Peres won on a 60-55 vote after a vitriolic debate and intense behind-the-scenes bargaining that stretched over 10 hours. The victory came from a majority of those present at voting in the 120-member Knesset, or parliament.

Shamir, who became the first premier in Israel's 42-year history to be turned out of office by a no-confidence vote, listened to the vote tally with his head down, glumly shuffling papers on his desk.

"We are not surprised, and I am not sorry," he told reporters later.

As a result of Thursday's loss, Shamir, 74, a former underground leader and spy master for the Mossad secret service, could face an unprecedented political trial.

Trade Minister Ariel Sharon and

House Minister David Levy, both of whom want to abandon the U.S. peace effort, have repeatedly sought to oust Shamir from the party leadership, which he assumed in 1983.

Starting Sunday, aides said, President Chaim Herzog will canvass parliament members as to who should form the next government. He is expected to give the nod to Peres, who would have a maximum of six weeks to assemble a coalition.

In the interim, Shamir will stay on as head of a caretaker government in which no ministers are allowed to resign and none can be added.

If Peres fails, Shamir or another Likud leader might be chosen to form a government, and if he was unable to do so, new elections may be called.

The past two elections, in July 1984 and November 1988, ended in virtual tie votes that forced the two big parties into coalitions.

The task of forming a new government is certain to be even more rigorous for Peres than toppling Shamir. The two parties could ultimately wind up back together in a national unity government, however reluctantly.

## Vatican, Soviets form ties for 1st time

VATICAN CITY (AP) — The Vatican and the Soviet Union established official ties Thursday for the first time since the 1957 Revolution.

The Vatican and Moscow said the two sides have agreed to exchange representatives with the rank of ambassador, extraordinary and apostolic nuncio. Initially, the representatives will not have permanent residences.

The ties fall short of full diplomatic relations. Vatican spokesman Jacques Navarro described them as "diplomatic relations."

The move was the latest of several

that have improved relations between Moscow and the Vatican after more than 70-year years.

The decision was made during the meeting at the Vatican in December between Pope John Paul II and Soviet Premier Mikhail Gorbachev. They were the first talks ever between a Roman Catholic pontiff and a supreme Soviet leader.

The Vatican will be represented by Archbishop Francesco Colasunanno, an Italian prelate who has been a loving Vatican envoy to Eastern Europe.

The name of the Soviet ambassador was not immediately announced.

The Vatican announcement said the pope and Gorbachev agreed to give an official character to contacts between Moscow and the Holy See to facilitate a "permanent dialogue on matters of mutual interest" and promote "cooperation" in the "international sphere."

The Vatican and Moscow had diplomatic relations under the Russian czars, but those ties were broken when the Communists came to power.

The Soviets long disparaged religion, but Gorbachev pledged to the pope that the Soviet Union would guarantee freedom of religion.

# Newsman dies; Britain recalls ambassador

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — Iraq on Thursday hanged a London-based journalist it accused of spying. That act ignited a storm of protest from European governments. Britain recalled its ambassador from Iraq and halted ministerial visits.

Thatcher wanted him alive. We sent him in a box." Information Minister Latif Nassayif Jassim said in breaking the news of the execution.

Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher had led the campaign to repeal the death sentence imposed on 31-year-old Farzad Bazoft. Bazoft was working for The Observer, a London weekly, investigating reports of an explosion at an Iraqi military facility when he was arrested.

Iraq claimed Bazoft had spied for Israel and Britain, charges Bazoft and his colleagues denied.

Observer editor Donald Treford and about 200 journalists held a vigil outside the heavily guarded Iraqi Embassy in London. Journalists left a single candle burning in Bazoft's memory in St. Bride's church, Fleet Street, London's former newspaper row.

"It is an awful day for the newspaper," said Treford. "We have had one of our number killed for simply being a reporter."

President Saddam Hussein of Iraq had said repeatedly his country did not fear Britain's anger, and the information minister repeated this after the execution.

"It seems the British could not understand our psychology that we are not intimidated," Jassim said. Hundreds of journalists from government-run Iraqi media applauded. Jassim said Bazoft's body was handed over to the British Embassy.

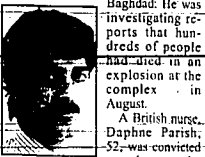
In London, Mrs. Thatcher said, "This is a very, very grave and serious matter. The Iraqi government's action is an act of barbarism which is deeply repugnant to all civilized people."

Foreign Secretary Douglas Hurd announced that Ambassador Harold Walker had been recalled from Baghdad. Hurd called off a trade mission to Iraq and said all ministerial visits had been halted.

Hurd also said all six Iraqi military trainees in Britain were being ordered to leave the country. But he said trade sanctions would likely harm Britain and "not alter the stance of this regime" in Iraq, so there were no plans to implement them.

Britain has a trade surplus of about

5648 million with Iraq. Bazoft, an Iranian-born journalist, was detained in September near a military industrial complex south of Baghdad. He was investigated reports that hundreds of people had died in an explosion at the complex in August.

A British nurse, Daphne Parish, 52, was convicted on charges she drove Bazoft to the Al-Iskandaria military complex and was sentenced to 15 years in prison. Ms. Parish had been working as a senior nursing administrator at an

Iraqi-run hospital in the Iraqi capital.

Robin Kealy, the British general consul in Baghdad, visited Bazoft shortly before his hanging at the Abu Ghirab prison in Baghdad. Kealy left the prison at 10:15 a.m.

In a British Broadcasting Corp. interview, Kealy said Bazoft looked "hollow-eyed and subdued" and repeated that he was not a spy. The embassy was called early Thursday with the news the execution was going to take place.

The first news of the execution in Iraq media came on the evening television news program.

The broadcast included a televised statement first broadcast in October in which Bazoft said he was a spy for Israel. He reportedly said in court during his trial last week the

statement was made under duress.

The television report said that when Bazoft was seized, security agents found reports he had written on the weather in Iraq and the military site he visited. Weather reports were considered classified information during the 1980-88 Iran-Iraq war.

The television report said Bazoft was disguised as an Indian doctor when he was arrested and was carrying some maps he had drawn.

Government-run newspapers on Thursday published what they called handwritten confessions by Bazoft in which he allegedly said he spied for Israel and Britain. Some were in English. All five documents bore a signature, simply the first name "Farzad."

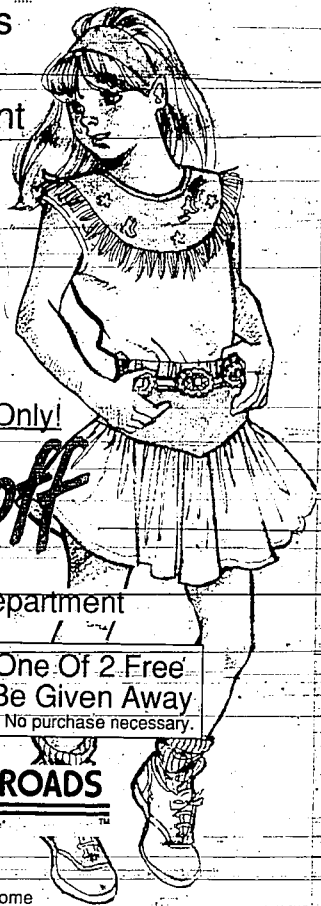

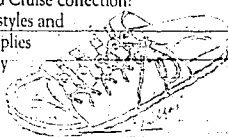

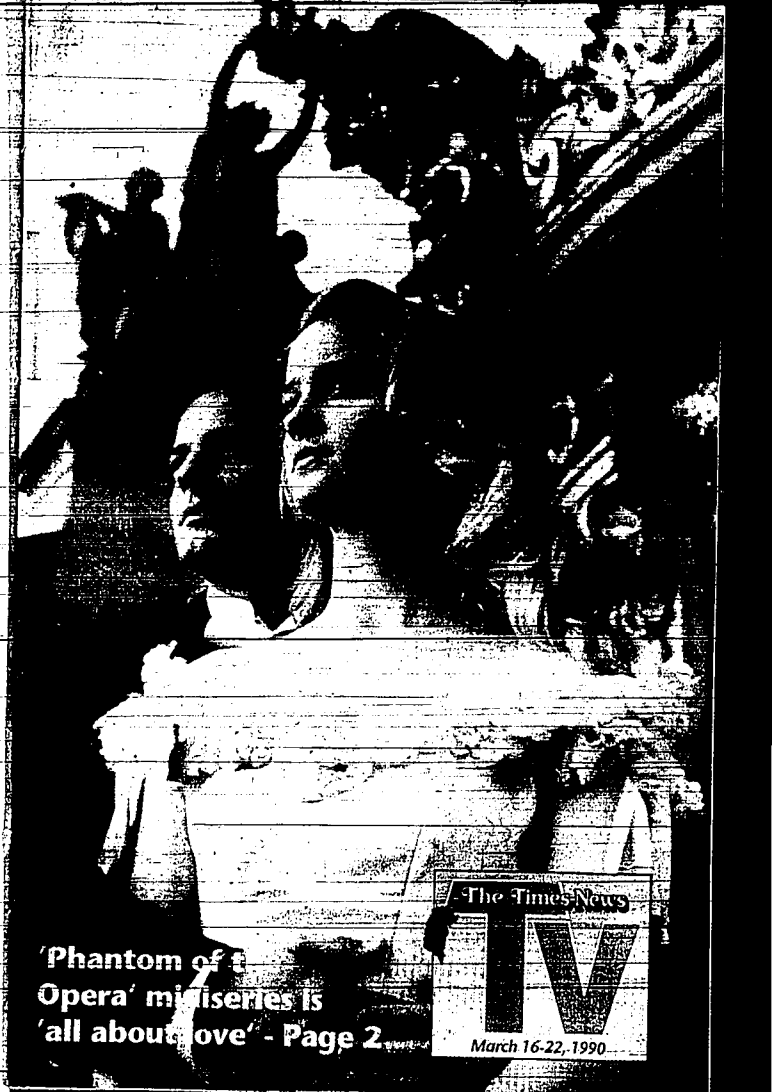

# NBC takes another look at the beauty and beast tale 'Phantom of the Opera'

By CONNIE PASSALACQUA

When NBC rolls out its "Phantom of the Opera" miniseries on Sunday and Monday, March 18 and 19, comparisons will inevitably follow, both to the Broadway show and to the 1925, 1943 and 1962 movie versions based on the classic novel by Gaston Leroux. Why is this turn-of-the-century story about a ghost/man who lives in the cellars of the Paris Opera House and falls for a young singer so alluring that NBC is serving up yet another version?

"It's all about love, man. It's a timeless story. Love is timeless, yeah." So explains Adam Storke, the young actor who plays Parisian playboy Count Phillippe de Chagny. The count sends naive country girl Christine Dacc (Teri Polo) off to the opera to train her voice. Instead, Christine is made a wardrobe girl. One night, the masked basement-dwelling Phantom (English actor Charles Dance) hears Christine singing and falls in love with her. And so the odd creature becomes Christine's secret voice coach.

"This is about a woman who has to choose between an aesthetic love and an artistic one," Storke says.

"There's something to be said about someone supporting one's goal, which the Phantom does. And the count is someone who needs love. He's never really had it before, and here's someone who's beautiful and wonderful. So he falls hard."

Storke goes on, "He's a sap! All he wants to do is chase Christine. It's a thankless job. Love is a universal and timeless issue. It's strange, yeah."

Loosely speaking, all of Storke's roles have revolved around love. The son of a movie producer and a retired actress, he made his TV debut in 1985 as a teen-age love interest on the since-canceled NBC daytime soap "Search for Tomorrow." He played poor girl Julia Roberts' rich boyfriend in "Mystic Pizza" (1987). He also played Valerie Bertinelli's doomed brother, Justin, in the "I'll Take Manhattan" miniseries. Asked the difference between acting in "Phantom" and "I'll Take Manhattan," he laughs. "This is serious! You're dealing with (director) Tony Richardson (who directed "Tom Jones" and other prestigious movies). He directed Olivier, man!"

Working in this miniseries also exposed Storke to another dramatic legend, Burt Lancaster, who plays former opera manager Carriere, the Phantom's confidant. "Burt is quite a guy," Storke says. "He's still a kid from Brooklyn. He was a true gentleman and a lot of help to me. He's so experienced and wise, and it

was nice for a young actor like me to be exposed to someone of that nature. Burt's a real guy."

The miniseries was mostly filmed in Paris. "We filmed at the real Paris Opera House, which is a character all unto itself," Storke says. "We also spent about a week high up on the roof filming the conclusion." Was it scary? "Oh yeah, especially when they put you in a harness and throw you out over the side and say, 'React.'"

Storke also says he found the inspiration for his character's coiffure (long, wavy, hairsprayed into place) at the Louvre. "I went and saw all these paintings of Napoleon." But wasn't Napoleon balding? Storke jibes, "Just kidding, folks. But the rest of the men of that period had long hair, and it looked very romantic. So my long hair seemed a natural for 'Phantom.'"

**Q:** Didn't the United States lose more men in the Vietnam War than in any other conflict? — I.T.

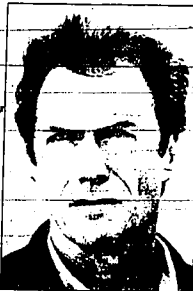

## Soap opera scene

# Bell at the helm of 2 popular worlds

It's 4 p.m. in the CBS offices of "The Young and the Restless," and boss William J. Bell watches the day's episodes of "Y&R" and "The Bold and the Beautiful" simultaneously on TV screens.

Bill Bell is the only man in town with two soap operas going on in his mind. He plays god, making choices, in complete control of his two daytime worlds. On "B&B," father Eric has fallen in love with son Ridge's ex-fiance Brooke and wants a divorce from powerhouse wife Stephanie. On "Y&R," Kay endures a kidnapping and Paul struggles to pin former-love Cussie with the murder of her husband.

Heady stuff. Because no one, not the sponsor nor network research, tells Bill Bell what to do. "Y&R" has been No. 1 for 55 consecutive weeks. The half-hour "B&B" ranks No. 6 and it's only 2 years old. Bill Bell makes millions for the beleaguered CBS.

Even better, Bell is one of the few men in the business who writes to please himself since the audience can't tell him what to do. "I'm two months ahead of viewers," Bell explains. "By the time fans react, I'm off on another track. Luckily, we both seem to agree most of the time."

During the mid-'50s, writer Bell worked with Irma Phillips on "The Guiding Light." At 8 a.m. we would block scenes together," Bell recalls. "Irma would work on the long form and I would go home and write a script."

Under the Phillips' tutelage, Bell learned his trade, moving from "Light" to "As the World Turns." Bell and Phillips dreamed up "Another World" and "Our Private World." Then Bell put "Days of Our Lives" on the map for 11 years before giving birth to "The Young and the Restless."

There he was, off in a cocoon of his own, writing in Chicago with help from wife Lee-Phillip Bell, sending scripts west for "Days" and "Y&R." Bell only ventured out to play tennis on the family court near Lake Geneva.

"I learned 20 years ago that a tennis court is a great investment for

unifying a family," says Bell. "On weekends we're still at it out here."

Bell is a great one to talk about the importance of family, and his new show "B&B" is all about that. Kids working with Dad in the fashion business. Just like the three Bell offspring — William, Bradley and Lauralee.

Young Bill runs the business end of the soaps. Bradley works on production and writes, and Lauralee plays Cricket on "Y&R," causing a ruckus last summer when her character was raped.

"I never dreamed the kids would take an interest in my work, since they followed shows like 'The Brady Bunch' back in Chicago," notes Bell. "When they became involved in daytime fare we moved west where I faced actors and production for the first time."

More control. Longer hours. Bill

Bell rises at 4 a.m. for exercise, then he's off to work. By 5 in the afternoon, he's bushed. Yet the man takes home footage. Tennis saves him on the weekends.

As for ideas, Bell spends 10 minutes each morning scanning Chicago and L.A. papers. He avoids TV dramas and the theater, preferring to stick with his own ideas and not be influenced by others.

Playing god can be exhausting, but it also can be sweet. Last Thursday, March 15, the Museum of Broadcasting honored Bill Bell with a special evening at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art. Now Bell is to be taken more seriously. An evening of honors but you can guess what's going on in the man's head — Eric and Brooke, Kay, Rex, Nikki and Victor pushing for

# 'Funniest Home Videos' captures top seat; 'Simpsons' fight back networks

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "America's Funniest Home Videos" had its highest-ever rating and captured first place in last week's Nielsen ratings, according to figures released Tuesday.

Fox's "The Simpsons" won its race against the larger broadcast networks for the first time.

"America's Funniest Home Videos," which uses video clips sent in by viewers, had a 24.1 rating for its time slot, according to the A.C. Nielsen Co. A repeat episode of "The Simpsons," Fox Network's cartoon series about a family, was 20th in the ratings.

It beat the first half-hour of a repeat show of CBS' "Murder She Wrote," in 29th place; ABC's "Elvis," tied for 47th, and the competing half hour of NBC's "Magical World of Disney," which landed in 71st place.

"His and Hers," a CBS half-hour comedy about married marriage counselors starring Martin Mull and Stephanie Faracy, was in a five-way tie for 49th place with a 10.8 rating.

The show's lead-in was "Newhart," in 33rd place, with a 13.0 rating.

For the week that ended Sunday, NBC was first with an average prime-time rating of 13.5, ABC had 12.2 and CBS 11.0. Each ratings point

## 'Today' gets rude awakening

NEW YORK (AP) — These are tough times for NBC's venerable "Today" show, the program that invented the morning TV format.

Last week it lost in the ratings to ABC's "Good Morning America" for the ninth consecutive week, and it lost the February "sweeps" to ABC for the first time since November 1985.

Is the sun going down on "Today"? Is this a new dawn for ABC's

"Good Morning America"? Will "CBS This Morning" emerge from the twilight of third place? Has success spoiled Bryant Gumbel?

"Today" ratings began declining with co-host Jane Pauley's poised and public departure from the show after 13 years. Her replacement, CBS newswoman Deborah Norville, apparently reminds some women of their least-favorite college roommate.

"The 'Today' show" has experienced a serious decline, about 15 percent on average, since Deborah Norville took over," said

David Marans, head of media research for the J. Walter Thompson advertising conglomerate.

"There was a clear reaction to the change in casting," he said. "We could see no other reason for the needle really moving."

CBS' morning efforts generally have run a distant third in ratings, almost since the network began competing with "Today" in 1954. Predecessors of "CBS This Morning" changed personnel, sets and style so often that a loyal viewer was someone who occasionally tuned in just to see who or what was still there.

The current CBS-edition's latest attempt at innovation, in February, was to cashier Harry Smith's co-anchor, Kathleen Sullivan, in favor of ex-ABC newswoman Paula Zahn and a barely discernible improvement in ratings.

ABC, keeping the same cast before its cameras, won the No. 1 spot without significantly increasing its ratings.

"It takes a long time to develop a team," said Jack Riley, executive producer of "Good Morning America." "It takes an even longer time for the audience to accept it."

Riley noted that, historically, "Today" has led in household ratings but ABC's show has been more popular among advertisers' most desirable target groups — women aged 18 to 49 and men and women aged 25 to 54.

NBC officials insist that they're not worried about the numbers.

"We knew there was going to be a drop in the ratings for the 'Today' show," said NBC research chief Bob Niles. "The good news is that we were pretty good about forecasting it. The bad news is we didn't want to see those numbers."

Niles said a similar ratings dip occurred after Gumbel replaced Tom Brokaw as co-host in January 1982. For the next two years, ABC beat "Today" like a gong. One week in August 1983, "Today" finished third for the first time.

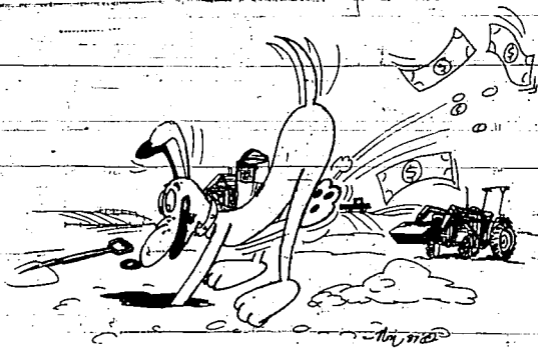
