Water looks short

TWIN FALLS — No one can predict the weather with certainty, but it doesn't take a meteorologist to recognize the implications written on the dry, exposed bed of the two-thirds-empty Magic Reservoir.

Low winter snowfall and a warm spring have resulted in snowpacks of 50 percent to 70 percent of normal across central and southern Idaho.

Thursday the reservoir contained about 58,000 acre feet, or about 30 percent of capacity.

Combined with the low inflow, that translates into about two months' worth of water, he said.

Most low water years farmers prefer to let the water run until it's gone, Oneida said.

"This year they'll get one and maybe part of a second (cutting) depending on weather," Oneida said.

Since the Magic Reservoir was

NOW aims for Oregon, Nevada next

WASHINGTON — The National Organization for Women is stepping up its fund-raising efforts for campaigns over ballot initiatives in Oregon and Nevada.

NOW officials on Thursday called those states the newest-battle grounds for abortion.

"We do not intend to lose Oregon," said NOW President Molly Yard, promising a strong fight against two proposed ballot questions that would limit abortion in the traditionally liberal state.

"What they are deciding is going to affect every woman in this country," she said. "It is not a state issue. It is a national issue."

She said the group is holding rallies in Oregon to fight the proposed initiatives and in Nevada to support a pro-choice referendum there.

Anti-abortion activists in Oregon are gathering signatures to place two questions on the ballot this fall that would put new limits on abortion in that state.

"They believe if they can win in one of the most progressive states in the nation, they will have an impact across the country," said Sheri O'Neil, a NOW vice president.

Yard said that abortion rights activists hope to head off possible action by Nevada's legislature, which does not meet this year but is considered strongly anti-abortion.

Twin Falls Border Patrol office may be threatened with closure

WASHINGTON — The commissioner of the Immigration and Naturalization Service wants to phase out Border Patrol stations in the nation's interior, including one in Twin Falls, an internal agency document suggests.

In a memorandum on INS reorganization, Commissioner Gene McNary expressed support for a policy whereby the Border Patrol would "be given explicit policy guidance to close sector offices remote from the border, and directed to transfer affected agents to border positions."

McNary said the process should occur "gradually."

At present, about 400 border patrolmen work at roughly 30 stations or sector headquarters more than 100 miles from the Mexican

and Canadian lines, typically in areas with farms or factories where illegal aliens might seek work.

The Twin Falls Border Patrol station, the only one in Idaho, has 11 staffers.

INS spokesman Duke Austin said, "there is no plan to close" interior stations, noting that the March 9 memorandum was a proposal that likely will be reviewed by the Justice Department, the Office of Management and Budget and Congress.

However, Austin added, "There is a policy to refill positions at the border and not at the interior."

Separate drug and immigration packages passed by Congress in 1986 resulted in more interior Border Patrol stations and an expanded mission for them, which now includes employer education programs, sanctions against those who hire illegal immigrants and

drug interdiction.

Although the INS budget has grown over the past few years, its funding has not kept pace with its increased responsibilities, experts said. They said cutting the interior stations — located in 13 states from Oregon to Florida — would be one of the tough decisions required by an inadequate INS budget.

Sources familiar with immigration issues said internal cutbacks would likely mean more work for state law enforcement agencies and INS investigations offices remote from the border, such as the Boise INS office, which has six investigators.

They said Commissioner McNary seems to be attempting to stop the problem of illegal aliens at the border at the expense of efforts further from the Mexican line.

WASHINGTON — President Bush was diagnosed Thursday with "an early glaucoma" in his left eye, but he said it had not affected his vision.

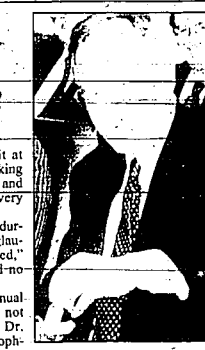
The glaucoma was found during the president's physical at Bethesda Naval Hospital, and will be treated with prescription eye drops, press secretary Marilyn Fitzwater said in a statement.

Otherwise, the 65-year-old Bush "is in excellent health," said White House physician Dr. Burton Lee in a statement released by the press office. "He continues to keep extremely fit through vigorous physi-

cal activities."

"I haven't felt a thing, felt it all," Bush told reporters. "I'm taking drops now ... one in the morning and one at night, but the vision is very good."

Fitzwater's statement said that during the examination, "An early glaucoma of his left eye was detected," but that "extensive tests showed no visual impairment."

Soviet civil war likely to erupt, experts believe

WASHINGTON — There is a one-in-three chance civil war will erupt in the Soviet Union over the next five years, an American expert on Soviet affairs predicted Thursday.

At the same time, top government officials portrayed the Soviet Union as a crumbling superpower wracked by military dissent and facing economic ruin.

"Most, if not all, of the ingredients are present for a civil war," said Jeremy R. Azrael, a senior Soviet expert with the non-profit Rand Corp., who previously served as a top Soviet analyst in the State Department and CIA.

"What you've got is a recipe for a massive implosion," he told reporters at a briefing. Azrael said the Pentagon should assign "a pretty high priority" to planning for the possibility of internal war breaking out in the Soviet Union.

While he and other Rand analysts said they doubted the Soviet Union would mount a war beyond its borders, a top Pentagon official acknowledged that instability within

the Soviet Union is causing concern over who would control the Soviet nuclear arsenal.

Henry S. Rowen, an assistant secretary of defense for international security affairs, who recently returned from the Soviet Union, told reporters earlier in the day that it is "understandable" that such questions are being asked in the West as Moscow's troubles mount.

Like the United States, Rowen said the Soviet Union has taken "great pains" to "assure central control" over the use of its nuclear weapons. "It's a good thing they have, given what's going on in the military," Rowen said.

"There's a lot of unhappiness" in the Soviet military, Rowen said, citing reports that thousands of draftees have failed to report for military duty and that many of those in uniform are defecting.

"These are signs of an organization in trouble," said Rowen, although he did not address the likelihood of civil war.

Late in the day, CIA Director William H. Webster said the Soviet

Universal expansion financing wins honor

TWIN FALLS — A trade magazine has chosen the Universal Frozen Foods expansion as one of the top 10 economic-development efforts in the United States for 1989.

Atlanta-based Site Selection magazine chose the cooperative project from about 400 projects nominated for recognition in the State Department and CIA.

"I'm thrilled," city Economic Development Director Dave McAlindin said. "It distinguishes us from other places," he said, showing "we put into action what we say."

The magazine chooses its annual winners based on "the value of some significant, something unusual," or some innovative action that had to be taken," magazine spokesman Paul Ryan said. The 31,000-circulation magazine targets corporate real-estate managers — the people who make decisions on where a company will locate.

The magazine also praised the cooperative effort between the Idaho Department of Commerce and Gov. Cecil Andrus.

Universal's \$20 million expansion has added more than 150 jobs and a \$3-million annual payroll to the Magic Valley, the company says, as well as creating a market for 5,000, new acres of potatoes.

The state law that allows tax-increment financing also limits how much of a city can do. Twin Falls has used 50 percent of what the law will do, McAlindin said, and doesn't plan to stop there.

"We in fact are working on a couple of other projects that would utilize tax-increment financing," McAlindin said. And other Idaho communities are calling Twin Falls for advice on how to use the law.

First Couple's income, taxes rise sharply, return discloses

WASHINGTON — A better-paying job and a healthy return on investments helped President Bush and his wife, Barbara, pull in income of \$456,780 last year, on which they paid \$101,382 in taxes.

A copy of the first couple's joint 1989 return, released Thursday by the White House, showed that the Bushes paid taxes equivalent to 22.2 percent of their total income.

The Quayles, whose return was released by his office, paid taxes of \$25,479 on an adjusted 1989 gross income of \$113,696. The year before, they paid \$24,344 on an adjusted gross income of \$156,546.

Quayle's 1989 income was boosted by nearly \$53,000 in speaking honoraria earned while in a senator — much of which was given to charities. Because he claimed fewer tax-deductible contributions in 1989, his tax liability rose.

The Bushes' tax return showed that the president and his wife earned \$208,274 last year from business holdings held in a blind trust, up from \$155,662 the previous year.

Greedy anti-choicers clamor for a scapegoat

Talk about sore losers. Two weeks after the fact, the zealots in Right to Life of Idaho continue to whine about Gov. Cecil Andrus' veto of their pet bill. The governor's "treachery," they assert in a statement released this week (excerpts of which are published in this section today) is solely responsible for leaving Idaho's unborn children defenseless against the evil abortionists. If the anti-choicers really want to pinpoint the cause of their current distress, they should look closer to home. To use a sports metaphor, Right to Life and its anti-choice teammates ended the game as heavy favorites. They had a majority of Idaho's Republican-dominated Legislature on their side. They had a Democratic governor with a long-standing commitment to the pro-life cause. They could have had almost any legislation they wanted. Instead, they got greedy. Instead of settling for a reasonable, modest, incremental assault on the Roe vs. Wade decision, they went for the Rolls-Royce of anti-abortion legislation, hood ornament and all. They pushed through a bill so stringent that Utah's legislature would not touch it. So stringent that a governor with strong pro-life leanings felt compelled to veto it. To return to the sports metaphor, they frittered away a 50-point lead. Now they blame the referee. Andrus instantly became the Great Satan of the Right to Life ayatollahs. In the black-and-white world of anti-abortion extremism, moderation is the greatest sin of all. A politician cannot be basically on their side, or mostly on their side, or even almost totally on their side. To the fanatics, he either marches in lockstep or faces the consequences. In this case, Right to Life of Idaho suggests the consequences will be a "massive pro-life backlash" against Andrus. Not likely. Idaho voters are broader of mind than that. Besides, we think the Right to Life lobby is in for a surprise come election morning. That surprise is that an overwhelming proportion of Idahoans are either pro-choice on the abortion issue, or at least do not want government involved in what many believe is a private issue. One of the great strengths of American politics is that single-issue fanaticism does not sit well with most people. Back in the mid-1980s, voters across Idaho rejected a long list of ideologues assorted right wingers in a series of legislative and statewide contests, returning Idaho to the kind of moderate, centrist and progressive representation it has generally had. We make this prediction: to the extent that Right to Life makes the abortion issue a litmus test for Andrus and others, we predict that voters will widen, not decrease, their margins of victory. In vetoing the proposal, Andrus has eloquently described the dilemma into which he was forced: to hand defeat to a cause he personally supported, or to approve an overreaching, compassionless law that would thrust Idaho into a costly and odious federal court bloodletting. Either option promised to earn him bitter enemies, neither choice would generate useful allies. In this no-win situation, Andrus was free to follow his conscience. By doing so, he saved Idaho from becoming Right to Life's stooge on the national stage. The ayatollahs are free to curse him if they choose. Amid all the howling, however, surely they realize the truth: that if they had been only a little less righteous, a little less rigid, a little more compromising, they could have passed a bill that Andrus would have signed. Surely they realize that, and it makes them all the more shrill in their clamor for a scapegoat.

Depiction of journalism amusing, ironic

I remember a long night, early in my journalism career, that I spent at the dingy Yolo County Election Department. It was Election Night, 1974. I was working part-time at the Davis Enterprise (circulation 5,000—when the wind was blowing in the right direction) while completing my studies at the University of California. I was paid the handsome sum of 25 cents an inch for my efforts at the Enterprise but, on this particular night, I was toiling into the early morning hours just for the love of my newfound craft. Actually, I was not working all that hard. I spent most of the time cooling my heels, drinking thermos coffee, until 3 in the morning. Tony Perry, the newspaper's star reporter and my mentor, was doing most of the work, and that pretty much involved fetching the election results as they became available and talking to the candidates who wandered into the election department. I was really there to observe, to learn, to get the thermos refilled when necessary. The fact that we worked for an afternoon paper, and that the story did not have to be filed until the next day, killed whatever urgency this assignment otherwise might have had.

It was not Watergate but, still, it had its appeal on that night, I felt that I had arrived. I was a journalist—to this day, I still harbor a certain affection for election nights. Journalism is made up of days and nights like that election night 16 years ago. Much of the profession involves routine. There are, of course, high points that sustain you, and there are special experiences so unique to the trade—the human-interest story that touches your own life, for example. But the veteran journalist understands the importance of routine, of detail, and appreciates the fact that hard work sometimes yields little in the way of tangible reward, not even a "job well done" on a day when that would be sufficient. I am always amused, then, by Hollywood's depiction of journalism, such as the television show that debuted Monday night on ABC, "Capital News." by so doing features a fictional newspaper in the nation's capital, where stories are crackling like Chinese firecrackers; where investigative re-

porters prowl like wildcats; where a Page 1 byline is the ultimate aphrodisiac; where reporters are not just writing stories, they are writing history; where ambition makes the pen a mighty sword, indeed, even if it has to be used against a colleague. A few more episodes like this and it will look more like Dynasty than the Daily Planet. The movie "All the President's Men" offered a fine portrayal of journalism in action, but that was a rare example of a true story about reporters written by reporters. And while "Lou Grant" often skirted the edges of realism, it also fell victim to the same kind of stereotypes and oversimplifications endemic to this genre. For all of its routine, journalism continues to play an important role in the democratic process. The public's right to know includes the need to understand how the journalism profession functions. Think as well of Easter as we do of Christmas

Without Christ, there would be no Christmas. For it is his name that bears the reason for which the season is celebrated. But then, too, without Christ, there would be no Easter. At least as it is celebrated by Christians. The message of Easter is important to every living person. It is not a new message. It is the message that should impress people because of its truthfulness and its motivating belief. It is a simple message. Yet, it is beautiful and magnificent. And though some difficulty may be had by some as to an appropriate response, the message of Easter is the greatest, the most exciting, the most significant and important doctrine that will ever be heard. It is the very essence of "good news." It is the gospel of Jesus Christ. The message of Easter, at least to the Christian world, may be considered as a four-fold message. First, it teaches that a Bethlehem babe would be born to a virgin named Mary. The miracle of that birth is spoken by some as an "immaculate conception." Second, the Easter message teaches that Christ would suffer an ignominious death. It was during the time of Christ that the crucifixion was the method of public execution amongst the Romans. It indeed was shameful, dishonorable and disgraceful. Yet, was Christ's crucifixion truly ignominious? Perhaps only in the sense that he was made to appear as a disgrace due to the tumultuous uprising of the multitude. His taking upon himself the sins of the world in the Garden of Gethsemane was more climactical than the ignominious crucifixion. Thus, the second message of Easter is that Christ, an innocent and just man, suffered and

died in an ignominious manner on the cross at Calvary for the blood and sins of the world. And by so doing, gave mankind the hope of his mediation between us and our Father in Heaven. Third, the Easter message teaches that Christ was resurrected. It is this message that is perhaps the most exciting part of the good news. For it is the end to which he allowed himself to suffer the crucifixion. If indeed Christ was resurrected, then will mankind have the fate as well? Thirteen separate appearances bear record that, at least to his believers, Jesus Christ was the fruits of the resurrection. He, in fact, gave meaning to the query, "Oh, death, where is thy sting?" For of all the victories in human history, none is so great, none so universal in its effect, none so everlasting in its consequences as the victory of the crucified Lord who came forth in the Resurrection that first Easter morning. Finally, the fourth message of Easter concerns his second coming to mankind. The empty tombstone testimony of his resurrection. Absent was the pain of torment. Absent was the long suffering of the cross. Absent was the bleeding at every pore in the garden. Instead, there now is the non-finality of death. For though it seems that death exists a dark shroud of loss, Christ and his resurrection provide a promise of comfort, assurance, and certainty. Death is not the end, but a genesis into a better world and greater light. There is no death nor stinging of death. The grave is robbed of its victory.

But there is a "change" with the recompense of a resurrection for all mankind. And in that recompense, there is also the Lord's eventual return—his Second Coming. That point in the history of mankind where we will witness his return. The Christian dogma proclaims this as the second and final coming. His first was while he ministered amongst the Jews. Will this Second Coming truly happen? Will Christ come again? Will we have a resurrection as was evidenced by him? This certainly is the Hope of Israel. Truly, it is the direction to which our Christian beliefs should focus. Without this reality, Christianity is doomed to destruction! Without a realization of this in our lives, we live in a hopeless mission of death—no light, no victory, no reward. "If a man die, shall he live again?" Job's response: "I know that my Redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth. But yet in my flesh shall I see God." Power plant shouldn't be built

This letter is to register my strong objection that the proposed Thousand Springs Power Plant should not be built. There has to be something morally wrong with a project that plunks an enormous coal-burning plant down in the middle of the cleanest air in the lower 48 states and then sends the electricity 800 miles away to Southern California where conservation hasn't been given a serious try. Here in the Pacific Northwest, conservation has meant a 25 percent decrease in demand. This project will seriously degrade air quality in most of eastern and southern Idaho. Utah will be impacted as well. The Wasatch Front in Utah and Pocatello, Idaho, areas with serious air-quality problems already will be made much worse. Air quality in nearby wilderness areas and national parks and monuments will be degraded. Acid rain will impact fish and aquatic life in high mountain lakes. This plant is a speculation built outside

the purview of any public utilities commission. There has been no serious and unbiased examination of true need. This fact, plus the emergency problems with global warming and the associated environmental problems, should give the BLM reason to examine an independent environmental impact statement and turn the project down. We both have discussed the agreement and the law preserving the upper third of the canyon for the public has been violated. When actual brief plans were submitted to

the EPA to discharge permits, it was they who called it to our attention—mostly because of possible water quality and the destruction of Wet Plover. The State Fish and Game, also the Parks Department and the Department of Water Resources all consider it a violation. You know I have a problem with ex-Sen. Ringert's statement that Mr. Hardy, who he says, prefers to leave the upper canyon undisturbed. This is the same person who said, when the Niagara hearing was being heard (it's on the record), that he would bulldoze the springs and put it in a collector to enhance his Rim View Trout project (same as was done up the road at Crystal Springs, by Clear Springs); but he'd see that we got 50 CFS of return flow which would be gunked up. Retail sales down 2 months in a row

WASHINGTON (AP) — A disappointing Easter shopping season and a beginning of a slump combined to push March retail sales down for the second straight month, the government said Thursday.

Sales fell 0.6 percent to a seasonally adjusted \$148.6 billion after a 0.3 percent drop in February, the Commerce Department reported.

The drop was the steepest in five months and marked the first two-month sales slump since October and November 1986. Only food stores posted higher sales.

"Consumers ... seem to be much more wary of spending money than they had been," said economist S. Jay Levy of Levy Economic Forecasts in Chappaqua, N.Y. "With home prices in many areas of the country falling, I think this gives pause to many people."

Stock prices rose immediately after the report's release. The new indication of continued sluggish economic growth suggested less upward pressure on interest rates than had been feared lately.

However, analysts pointed to a number of mitigating factors that softened the news.

February sales, originally reported as falling 0.9 percent and later revised to a minus 0.8 percent, were revised upward again, this time sharply.

Both months followed a very strong January increase of 2.8 percent.

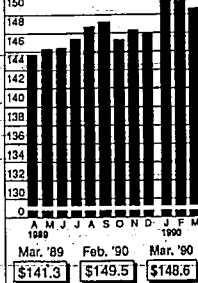
Easter this year falls three weeks later than it did last year.

Some clothing and department store sales that would have occurred in March with an earlier Easter were thus shifted to April.

Sales in the first three months of the year were up 3.5 percent from

the same period of 1989. However, some of the gain was attributed to unseasonably mild weather and auto discounting in January.

Retail sales, which account for about a third of all economic activity, are closely watched as a barometer of economic health.

In recent months, consumer demand, particularly for high-priced items such as autos, has been weakened by the Federal Reserve Board's policy of using high interest rates to dampen demand and

consequently inflationary pressures.

Car dealers and auto parts stores reported their fifth sales decline in six months. Sales totaled \$30.7 billion in March, down 1.4 percent

after a 6.5 percent drop in February.

James Brown to teach drug education

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — With two inmates carrying his suitcases, "Godfather-of-Soul" James Brown started a brand-new bag Thursday.

He was transferred from prison to a work-release center to counsel youths about drug abuse.

The two-time Grammy award winner was released after serving 15 months of a one-year prison sentence for aggravated assault.

He will be locked up nights and weekends at the minimum security Lower Savannah Work Center 60 miles from Aiken, where he will help educate young people about the dangers of illegal drugs and alcohol.

When asked how it felt to be back home in Aiken County, the 56-year-old singer raised his hands and said, "This is home."

Brown was wearing a bright blue shirt, vest and black leather pants as two inmates helped him carry his three suitcases after his arrival

from the State Park Correctional Center in Columbia. His job starts Monday. He will earn at least the minimum wage of \$3.80 an hour, officials said.

Brown billed himself as the Hardest Working Man in Show Business during his four decades as a rhythm and blues singer.

He grunted, groaned and gyrated to pop stardom with 114 charted singles such as "Papa's Got a Brand New Bag," "Please, Please, Please," "I Got You (I Feel Good)," "Cold Sweat," "I'm Black And I'm Proud," "Hot Pants" and more recently, "Living in America."

The wavy-haired Brown was imprisoned in December 1988 to serve a concurrent six-year sentence in Georgia and South Carolina for failing to stop for police, aggravated assault and weapons violations stemming from a two-state, high-speed chase that ended when police shot out the tires on his pickup truck.

The incident began when a gun-toting Brown stormed an insurance agency next to his office and claimed strangers had used his bathroom. Tests showed Brown had used the illegal drug, PCP. He had earlier been arrested several times for illegal drug use.

He becomes eligible for parole in South Carolina on May 5, 1991, and in Georgia in March 1992.

At the Aiken-Barnwell County Community Action Commission, Brown will try to talk young people out of using drugs and alcohol, said George Anderson, executive director.

"That name is going to bring the people out," Anderson said. "His name alone can command a crowd. You or I couldn't draw the attention he will."

Reaction to his work-release was less than enthusiastic at Top Notch Entertainment, Brown's production and booking agency.

FBI wants to gather evidence without subpoenas

WASHINGTON (AP) — The FBI wants to extend its power to seize some evidence in criminal investigations without the need for grand jury subpoenas, but the Justice Department has qualms about the move, a department spokesman said Thursday.

Prosecutors are concerned the new seizure powers sought by the FBI might go too far, spokesman David Runkel said.

The proposed expanded authority would allow FBI agents to seize documents such as office and bank files and other records without a grand jury subpoena issued through a Justice Department prosecutor and without a search warrant. They would need only an administrative

summons that FBI agents could issue on their own.

However, law enforcement officials would still have to obtain a court-approved search warrant before they could enter a person's home or office without the person's approval.

The New York Times reported on the issue in Thursday's editions.

Janitor Goldman, an American Civil Liberties Union lawyer, criticized the proposal, telling the Times that there would be court challenges if the new authority is approved. "The FBI has made absolutely no case for this sort of administrative exemption," and he would vigorously oppose it, he said.

FBI spokesman Mike Kortan noted the bureau got the expanded authority for drug investigations several years ago. "At this point, we're exploring the possibility of extending that to other criminal matters," he said.

Kortan said a major reason for the expanded authority is to save time during investigations.

"In certain parts of the country, geography plays a factor," he said, noting securing a subpoena in some cases requires a great deal of travel.

Kortan said draft legislation to provide the expanded authority has been developed by the House Government Operations subcommittee on commerce, consumer and monetary affairs,

whose chairman is Rep. Doug Barnard, D-Ga.

A call to the subcommittee office was not immediately returned Thursday.

Attorney General Dick Thornburgh has not yet gotten involved in discussions between the FBI and prosecutors on the issue, Runkel said.

"If it gets to him, he will get involved," he said. "It may be resolved prior to getting to him."

"The discussions now are going on at the proper level, between the prosecutors and the investigators," he said. "Before anything would go forth, if anything would go forth, the attorney general would get involved at that time."

Starkist bans tuna caught with dolphins

WASHINGTON (AP) — Starkist, the world's largest tuna canner, said Thursday it will no longer buy or sell tuna captured along with dolphins, winning strong praise from environmentalists who have long sought to protect dolphins from fishing nets.

Environmentalists and lawmakers said they hoped the move would save some of the estimated 100,000 dolphins that die annually in the huge driftnets used to catch schools of tuna.

Starkist will not purchase any tuna caught in association with dolphins, said Anthony J.F. O'Reilly, president of the H.J. Heinz Co., which owns the Starkist Seafood Co.

Korea could build nuclear weapons

WASHINGTON (AP) — A senior Pentagon official said Thursday the United States believes North Korea has the facilities to build nuclear weapons but the Asian nation is not moving rapidly on the work.

Henry S. Rowen, assistant secretary of defense for international security affairs, said U.S. officials have evidence the North Koreans have built a reactor as well as a reprocessing facility to separate plutonium, the material used to make nuclear weapons.

"I would not want to characterize it as a slow pace but a deliberate pace," Rowen told reporters at a news briefing in which he assessed North Korea's work on manufacturing nuclear weapons. "However, it's not galloping ahead at a great rate."

Rowen said North Korea "seems to be proceeding at some rate. I don't want to describe it as a crash program. It's a concern to us and the Japanese."

Moore pleads guilty to 4 charges

CHARLESTON, W.Va. (AP) — Former three-time Gov. Arch A. Moore Jr. agreed Thursday to plead guilty to extortion, mail fraud, tax fraud and obstruction of justice, a prosecutor said.

Moore could be sentenced to 36 years in prison and fined \$1.2 million, said U.S. Attorney Michael Carey, who announced the plea agreement and the five-count indictment at a news conference.

The indictment accused the Republican Moore of committing illegal acts relating to his 1984 campaign, his third term as governor from 1985 to 1989, and his unsuccessful 1988 campaign.

Pressure put on welfare program

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Opponents of a state welfare experiment that cuts benefits for families whose teen-agers play hooky are pressuring the government to withdraw its permission for the program.

But Gov. Tommy G. Thompson, who introduced the Learnfare program two years ago, wants to expand the program to include elementary school children.

He's also considering plans that would refuse to increase benefits to single mothers who have more children while on welfare rolls and would allow welfare recipients to work more than 100 hours a month and still receive benefits.

Atwater released from hospital

WASHINGTON (AP) — Republican Party chairman L. Atwater, described as "in fighting trim," was released Thursday from a New York hospital where he was treated for a brain tumor.

"He's in excellent spirits," said Dr. Paul Komblith, the neurologist who treated Atwater at Montefiore Medical Center. "He's quite enthusiastic; he's gaining strength physically."

Komblith led a team that implanted radioactive isotopes in the tumor on the right side of Atwater's brain. Physicians hope the isotopes will halt the growth of the tumor and kill the cancerous cells.

Shuttle launch reset for April 25

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — NASA on Thursday set April 25 as the new launch date for space shuttle Discovery and the \$1.5 billion Hubble Space Telescope, the agency's most expensive and complex payload.

The first launch attempt was scrubbed four minutes before liftoff Tuesday when one of Discovery's three auxiliary power units failed.

"The date is based on the decision to remove and replace APU No. 1 on space shuttle Discovery and to allow time for recharging the Hubble Space Telescope batteries," NASA said in a statement.

Mongolia drops word 'communism'

ULAN BATOR, Mongolia (AP) — The world's second-oldest ruling Communist Party dropped the word "communism" from its constitution Thursday and set a new goal of building "democratic humane socialism."

An extraordinary congress of the Mongolian People's Revolutionary Party adopted a new party constitution and platform to reflect its recent acceptance of democratic reforms and opposition parties.

A proposal to change the party's name, dropping the word "revolutionary," was defeated.

The party, which is trying to change its image to keep power in free elections, appeared to be suffering from an identity crisis.

3 hostages freed from Beirut emerge

PARIS (AP) — The three hostages freed in Beirut this week emerged from seclusion Thursday but refused to answer questions, saying any comments could jeopardize efforts to free four family members still held.

Foreign Minister Roland Dumas said France had been the victim of a "false trial" regarding its dealings with Libya concerning the hostages release.

Newspapers across Western Europe, including some in France, criticized the government for its warm praise of Libya's leader, Col. Moammar Gadhafi, after the hostages were freed Tuesday by Libyan-backed Palestinian guerrillas.

The three — Jacqueline Valente of France, Fernand Houtekins of Belgium, and their daughter, Sophie-Liberte — met briefly with the press for the first time since arriving in Paris late Tuesday. They had been staying at a military hospital.

E. German Parliament elects de Maiziere

EAST BERLIN (AP) — East Germany's Parliament chose Lothar de Maiziere as prime minister on Thursday and embraced his sweeping agenda for quickly uniting the founding nation with West Germany.

The nation's first freely elected legislature also apologized to Jews for Nazi atrocities and promised to make reparations to Israel and seek diplomatic ties.

By ousting de Maiziere's broad coalition government in power, the Parliament set up a transitional government whose prime goal will be to negotiate the terms of creating a single Germany.

Before Parliament met, members of the coalition agreed that a united Germany should remain part of NATO and that East Germany should merge its currency with West Germany's by July 1.

British inflation rate jumps .6 percent

LONDON (AP) — Britain's annual inflation rate jumped to 8.1 percent in March from 7.5 percent in February, largely because of increases in mortgage rates, the government said Thursday.

The increase brought inflation to its highest level since July, when it was 8.2 percent. Unemployment held steady at 5.6 percent in March, the government said.

Britain's inflation rate, the worst among the major industrialized nations, is expected to move up to 9 percent before decreasing. Curbing resurgent inflation is Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher's No. 1 economic priority, and 15 percent interest rates are her weapon.

Chancellor of the Exchequer John Major said that a new per-capita tax called the community charge, introduced this month, will boost the inflation rate.

Chinese student leader escapes

HONG KONG (AP) — Another fugitive student leader of the crushed pro-democracy movement has escaped China through an underground railroad, which is still operating 10 months after the crackdown on dissent, a reliable source said.

"I want everybody to know that the channel is still alive, there's still truth," said the source, who is close to the railroad. The source refused to be identified further and asked that the date of the interview not be published, for security reasons.

He refused to divulge details of the escape route.

The source said Wang Chaohua fled China on or about Jan. 7. She was on a list of 21 students sought by the Chinese government for leading demonstrations last spring for more freedom in the Communist country. Wang, 38, was by far the oldest person on the list and exerted a strong influence over the others.

The source said he did not know where she has settled in the West.

U.S. puts Seoul district off limits

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — U.S. officials put a popular entertainment and disco district in Seoul off limits to American personnel Friday in an attempt to stem anti-American violence and protect U.S. soldiers.

A statement issued by the U.S. 8th Army for the 43,000 U.S. troops, thousands of civilian employees and their dependents in South Korea said the Itaewon entertainment district would be off limits indefinitely from midnight until 5 a.m., effective Friday. Many American families live in the area.

British seize tube intended for Iraqi weapon

LONDON (AP) — Customs officers seized a huge forged steel tube ordered by Iraq after military experts determined Thursday that it could be used to build a gun capable of hurling nuclear or chemical warheads hundreds of miles.

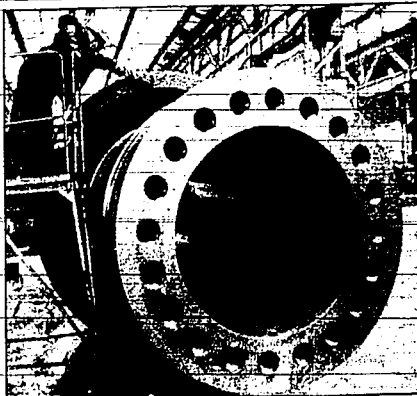
Iraq denied the accusation, and the British manufacturer said the tube would blow up if anyone tried to use it as a gun barrel.

Arms experts say a gun with a barrel the size of the tube seized by Customs — 113 feet long with a 39-inch bore — could fire artillery shells as far as Tehran or Tel Aviv, each within 350 miles of Iraq's borders. Such a weapon would be the longest gun ever made.

"There is no question it could be used as a barrel of a large artillery gun to fire a projectile of some considerable size. It is definitely subject to export licensing controls," said Douglas Tweedle, head of the Customs and Excise Office.

In Washington, State Department spokesman Richard Boucher said the United States was asking the British government for information about the impounding action and would have no comment for the time being.

British news reports speculated that an Iraqi gun project could be linked to Gerald Bull, an American ballistics expert who was killed in Brussels on March 22. Bull, 62, a Canadian-born American citizen, was found shot to death with \$20,000

in his pockets, Belgian police said.

Jane's Defense Weekly said Bull had been a principal designer of South Africa's G5 howitzers, which have been sold to Iraq. In 1980, he was convicted in Vermont, where he had taught at Norwich University, on charges of smuggling arms to South

Africa.

On March 28, customs officials seized U.S.-made parts for atomic bomb triggers that were bound for Iraq. Bull has confirmed it has chemical weapons but denied seeking a nuclear capability.

Hussein threatened to use missiles armed with chemical warheads against Israel if Iraq attacked his country.

The seizure of the triggers and Iraq's execution March 15 of a British-based reporter convicted of spying have soured British-Iraqi relations.

"Even if we bought a box of chocolates from Britain, they would say Iraq will use it to produce an atom bomb," Iraqi Foreign Minister Tariq Aziz told reporters in Mosul, Iraq.

"Everything that is said about these pipes is baseless," said Naief Hassan, press attaché at the Iraqi Embassy in London. "The British and the Israelis are trying to make a fuss about this matter. Even the company itself said that these pipes are used for only petrochemical industries."

The Iraqi government and the reported manufacturer, Sheffield Forgemasters, had insisted the equipment impounded was a pipe designed for a petrochemical plant. The company said the government's Department of Trade and Industry had reviewed and approved the project.

Phillip Wright, chief executive of Sheffield Forgemasters, said the company had been approached by Iraqis about building gun barrels, but the company refused after consulting the British government.

Slow pacing real killer in 'I Love You'

HOLLYWOOD — Just why "I Love You to Death" ultimately doesn't work is really quite puzzling. . . .
A black comedy with its roots in a real event, it centers around Rosalie Boca (Tracey Ullman), an unsuspecting wife who seems to be the last person in Tacoma, Wash., to

realize the energy with which Joey (Kevin Kline), her Italian-born husband, has been philandering. The explosion when she does learn is monumental.

Rosalie, largely at the urging of her spirited Yugoslav momma (Nadja Joan Plowright), decides that death is a pretty sensible payback for Joey, a not-untypical first impulse in such circumstances. But somewhere between this impulse and the finale, the air goes out of the comedy.

It's peculiar. Lawrence Kasdan, the director, has cast his loving hotbeds and zanked out would-be murderers marvelously, led by a determined Plowright, her round brown eyes snapping with vengeance. Then there are the drug-drenched cousins Harlan and Marlon James (William Hurt and Keanu Reeves, respectively), who seem to have come to life from the front page of the *National Enquirer*, just under the Frog Baby Ax Murders.

You might not hire this pair to work your sump pump, but Rosalie's devoted young pizza-parlor assistant, Devo Nod (River

Phoenix), corals them up as last-minute killers for hire. Phoenix's playing of this '60s throwback, only slightly more connected to the world than his bosses, is a thoroughgoing delight.

Finally, in a demonstration that one can be unforgettable even in the unist role, there is Miriam Margulies as Joey's glowering virago of a mother, who knows right from wrong as clearly as momma Nadja.

Oddly enough, for someone who has built her devoted American television following playing a

twice-in-either case can the women do the honors; they begin with the sweet-tempered Devo and, conscience-stricken, he moves on to his inspiration of the James boys. Somehow during this infinite night, with Joey's blood seeping into his pillow, with Harlan and Marlon arriving in a taxicab for their hit work, and with Marlon taking practice swipes in the air with a baseball bat in case their 22 isn't enough, the humor coagulates. It may well have been how it all happened, but to get away with humor this black, briskness seems to be in order.

The pace of the direction and — especially — of the screenplay by playwright-television-writer John Kostmayer — begins to crawl, weighing down everything. Even the impulse to kill Joey begins to seem a little . . . extreme.

He begins to be sweetly sympathetic; his manners toward guests are impeccable, even as he's glowing with barbiturates and shot at least once and even when the guests are Harlan and Marlon.

The movie's slowness doesn't affect Hurt's performance; slow is the only way Harlan's mind works these days, and at that, he's eight years ahead of Marlon, who keeps failing to recognize Joey.

Hurt's slow-dawning play of expressions as he explains major points to Marlon or works them out for himself is a model of precise, nonchalantly funny acting. Reeves, whose hair looks as though it has been gnawed by cellar rats, is fine, approaching although not quite in Hurt's league.

You only wish that they — or the magic of Phoenix, Plowright and Margulies together — could save the entire piece. This is the first of Kasdan's films. Torn a screenplay by anyone else is there a moral-looking there somewhere?

'Red October' makers did good job of using technology carefully

THE HUNT FOR RED OCTOBER (PG). There's an admirable smartness to this underwater thriller. Its film makers know that a little technology goes a very long way, and if they hope to keep an audience's attention they'll have to do it with story, not hardware.

Director John McTiernan, whose signature is sleek action ("Die Hard"), his first-rate cast (including Sean Connery, Alec Baldwin, Scott Glenn and Sam Neill) and writers Larry Ferguson and Donald Stewart have managed this nicely.

You may not be limp from accumulated tension when this hunt is over, but its cautiously upbeat global message leaves a satisfying glow and the premise is a crackerjack one.

DRIVING MISS DAISY (PG). Morgan Freeman gives an immensely gracious and subtle performance as an Atlanta chauffeur in this rather musty adaptation of Alfred Uhry's 1987 Pulitzer Prize-winning play.

Jessica Tandy is the cranky widow. Their performances give the

film a human gravity that helps counteract the too-measured pacing, its one of civic uplift. Directed by Bruce Beresford from Uhry's adaptation of his play.

JOE VS. THE VOLCANO (PG). This slyly stylized production opens with Hanks-Joe Banks marching off to his wretched job at a medical supply conglom and sends him off on a journey worthy of Robert Louis Stevenson and Maurice Sendak, with just of hint of David Byrne thrown in for the sheer surreal unexpectedness of it.

The effortless pairing of Tom Hanks and Meg Ryan makes this contemporary fable a thoroughgoing delight and marks screenwriter John Patrick Shanley as a director with a nicely preposterous sense of storytelling and a gorgeous eye.

PRETTY WOMAN (R). Updating "Pygmalion" and sprinkling it with Cinderella dust may seem like a perfectly workable idea until you get into the nuts and bolts of "Pretty Woman."

Here, Richard Gere's bored cipher of a corporate raider transforms Julia Roberts' happy Hollywood Boulevard hooker into a Lydia he can pass off at a polo match in less than a week.

This is a movie that barely has a moment to call its own and the ones it has are gamy, materialistic and possibly life-threatening. Some fairly tale for the '90s.

TEENAGE MUTANT NINJA TURTLES (PG). Kevin the comic book instead. Or even the cereal. This adaptation of Terry Eastman and Peter Laird's chop-socky comic spoof, in which mutated, masked-hero turtles and their rat mentor wreak havoc on New York's villains, is a triumph of marketing, name recognition and product tie-ins.

Also, Jim Henson's Creature Shop has come up with some terrific puppets.

'I Love Lucy' pilot found, will air on CBS

All you Lucille Ball lovers out in TV-land, you're in for a nice surprise.

The audition tape (these days known as a pilot) for "I Love Lucy," which runs 34 minutes, and which has never been seen on television, has been found and will be seen in May as part of a CBS special devoted to Lucy.

The tape — actually a kinescope, a film shot off a TV monitor — was uncovered by Bud Grant, CEO of the Grant/Tribune Co. According to Grant, a former long-time programming boss at CBS, the tape was labeled "Lucy-Desi-Pepito Audition."

It was given in 1951 to the late and famous clown, Pepito, by Lucy and her then-husband and co-star, Desi Arnaz, in appreciation for his support of their act during their vaudeville careers and earliest days in television.

Pepito appears as a guest on

the audition show.

His widow, Joanne Perez, who has had this one-and-only copy of the audition in her possession since then, gave the print to Grant.

Jeff Sagansky, current programming chief of CBS, was so thrilled about this found treasure that he decided to build an entire hour around it, reports Grant, who'll produce the hour for CBS.

(It won't be Grant's first project with his former company. Valerie Bertinelli's "Sydney," one of the network's new series, is a Grant/Tribune production.)

Grant said they'll begin filming the wraparounds for the special, which will deal with how "I Love Lucy" came into being, on April 17.

In the "Lucy" pilot, Pepito contributes his clown bits and Desi and Lucy do their famous cello routine, seal act and "Cuban Pete"/"Sally Sweet" medley.

Demento celebrates 20 years of mad music

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — Who is that mad-hatted man, and what is he doing on the radio? Let him speak for himself.

"Whooo, whooo, whooo, wind up your ears, dementities and dementoids! It's time for the 'Dr. Demento Show' with mad music and eeraaaaaazy comedy from the archives and off the wall!"

That's how he got his horn, and Dr. Demento — a.k.a. Barrett E. "Barry" Hansen — is off to a mad start.

"The Dr. Demento Show," heard everywhere from Antarctica to Alabama, is the only major radio outpost for wacko recordings ranging from "The Purple Peeler-Eater" to early 20th century comedy to rap-scratchin' takeoffs on "Star Trek."

Every week, the show is on 193 commercial radio stations through the Westwood One Radio Networks, and on 35 college stations and about 500 Armed Forces Network stations on ships or bases.

Hansen — whose trademark is a tux and top hat — is celebrating 20 years on commercial radio. Despite his goofy voice and noisemakers, he calls himself a "straight man" to the records he plays.

Hansen isn't really a doctor, but if anyone were handing out Ph.D.'s in Music of All Persuasions, he would be first in line. His knowledge of music spans the blues, folk, classical, rock and novelty tunes.

He occasionally helps Casey Kasem choose old songs for "Casey's Top 40," introduced Weird Al Yankovic to the world and influences other radio personalities.

"I think he's great. I love him; I've been a fan for years," said Scott Shannon, vice president and program director at both Westwood One and Los Angeles' "Pirate Radio" (KOLZ).

It all began when Hansen was 4 years old, just a pup in Minneapolis. He was already fascinated by the family's gramophone and could



handle playing the fragile 78 rpm records himself.

His father, an arts aficionado, brought home some Spike Jones records, including "Cocktails for Two." The 1945 recording starts with a man crooning about an "exquisite rendezvous," but goes crazy with loud crashes, guns going off and — people — screaming "Whooped!"

"I planted the seed in my little brain which 25 years later became the 'Dr. Demento Show,'" Hansen said in an interview during a recent visit to his alma mater, Reed College.

Hansen got his start in radio at Reed's station, KRRC, where he was manager and the deejay for different shows.

After graduating in 1963, he took off for the "smogberry trees" of Los Angeles. He worked at the Ash Grove music club, introducing such greats as Lightnin' Hopkins, Bill Monroe and Arlo Guthrie. He did short stints as a roddie for Canned Heat and Spirit, produced a couple of records and put together re-issues for Specialty Records.

His first time behind the mike, he played classics by Carl Perkins, Screamin' Jay Hawkins and others, and threw in a juicy teen car crash tune, "Transfusion," by Nervous Norvus. "Somebody said 'You've got to be demented to play that on the radio,'" Hansen said. The name Dr. Demento stuck.

"I found the most bizarre and outrageous things were the ones that got the biggest response." So he gave the audience what it wanted.

Hansen moved to Los Angeles' KMET in 1971, went into syndication in 1974 and watched radio change.

When he started at KMET, DIS mixed up classical, country, jazz and rock — all in one show. But during the '70s, the station got rid of all but its rock records, Hansen said. Then management "started telling (DIS) exactly what they had to play from those albums, and the next step of course was putting it all on computer programs," Hansen said. The same is true at almost every other commercial station.

But Dr. Demento survived.

He switched to Los Angeles' KLSX in 1987, where he does a live version of his show that's sometimes wilder than the syndicated one.

'Ninja Turtles' grabs \$18.8 million at box office

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The pizza-eating "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles" continued to gorge at the national box office, grossing \$18.8 million in its second weekend atop the leader board, according to recently released figures.

"Ninja Turtles" has made more than \$50 million, becoming the biggest money winner yet for New Line Cinema, according to new figures from Exhibitor Relations Co. In its debut weekend, the live-action film grossed \$25.4 million.

Showing few signs of fading in second was the prostitution comedy "Pretty Woman," starring Richard Gere and Julia Roberts, which collected \$11.3 million. The Walt Disney Co. said "Pretty Woman" is on a pace to equal the studio's 1987 hit "Three Men and a Cradle."

In third was the new comedy "Ernest Goes to Jail," featuring Jim Varney in the latest sequel about the annoying dimwit title character. "Ernest Goes to Jail" had ticket sales

of \$6.1 million, the best opening yet in the Ernest trilogy.

The new adventure "The First Power" opened well, too, making \$5.7 million in its first weekend of release. It was followed in fifth by "The Hunt for Red October," which netted \$5 million.

"I Love You to Death," a comedy about adultery and murder for hire, landed in sixth with a gate of \$4 million. In seventh was best picture winner "Driving Miss Daisy," grossing \$3.2 million.

The latest effort from bizarre director John Waters, "Cry Baby," opened poorly in eighth place, collecting just \$3 million while playing on 1,219 screens. It was followed in ninth by the Dana Carvey comedy "Opportunity Knocks" with ticket sales of \$2.1 million. Rounding out the Top 10 was the Tom Hanks-Meg Ryan comedy "Joe Versus the Volcano" on receipts of \$1.5 million.

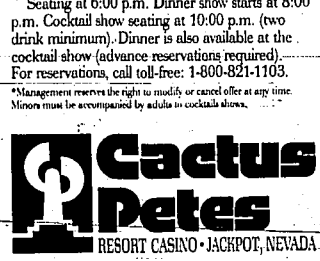

Christian rap groups skillful at jamming to make a joyful noise

So you can't imagine Oral Roberts University and the Rev. Jerry Falwell's Liberty University as breeding grounds for rap music?

You, E.T.W., kick it one time: We're soldiers of the Lord, we're willing and able. Upright before God, all cards on the table. We come before you now with the message of truth.

Take it in if you want, but if you don't, it's on you.

This is Christian rap, and it's happening. The three young men known as E.T.W. (E.T. = Eternity, W = Wisdom) quit their jobs waiting tables in Tulsa to devote themselves full-time to rap. The group began at Oral Roberts University in 1985, and its self-titled debut album was released last fall.

Then there's P.I.D. (Preachers in Disguise), S.F.C. (Soldiers for Christ), D-Boy, J.C. & the Boyz, DC Talk, Stephen Wiley and others.

With song titles like "Get You a Bible," "Stompin' Satan" and "This Is What He Went Thru," the Christian rappers take the same in-your-face approach to their lyrics as mainstream rappers do, except that mainstream rappers generally are notorious for their, uh, worldliness, as reflected in such tunes as "Big Ole Butt" and "Fat Gold Chain."

Something else the Christian rappers borrow from their secular counterparts is the funky, hip-hop dance beat. "If we don't have that, we can't hope to get to the kids," says Ron Griffin, president of the Nashville-based ForeFront Communications Group.

Griffin last year launched Yo!ForeFront, a record label devoted exclusively to Christian rap. It has released albums by DC Talk and E.T.W. and this summer will introduce True M.C. The company is also

looking for new talent.

In a way, the emergence of Christian rap shouldn't be too surprising. The "contemporary Christian" record business of the 1980s transcended gospel and inspirational songs to become a microcosm of American popular music.

Most people familiar with the pop style of Christian superstar Amy Grant probably don't know there's a thriving market for Christian rock and even Christian heavy metal.

Only recently has rap, created and cultivated by America's black urban youth, caught on big with young whites across the country. That's largely due to daily exposure on MTV. This crossover success is what's moving the Christian marketplace. Most Christian rap is being pitched to white, Christian-rock radio, not to black-gospel radio.

"We find the audience that's buying rap music is the same audience that's buying heavy metal. That means mostly white

teens, 13 to 18," says Tony Shore, a spokesman for Frontline Records of Santa Ana, Calif., which has P.I.D. and D-Boy. "Junior-high-school kids are buying Christian rap like crazy."

"Frankly, I'm a little surprised by it," says John W. Styll, editor and publisher of Contemporary Christian Music, which monitors the trade. "I thought it was really a trendy, faddish sort of thing when it first started. But suddenly we've got rap albums on our (Christian-rock) chart."

So far, it's a big noise in a small room. DC Talk, one of the most popular Christian rap groups, has sold more than 50,000 copies of its debut album, "DC Talk," primarily through Christian bookstores. Today's rap stars routinely sell 10 or 20 times that many.

But proponents of Christian rap say they're ready to make a move on the rap market at large.

"We had a vision that we would go out into the world, go out into coliseums and not just into churches," says 22-year-old Fred Lynch of P.I.D., widely acknowledged to be one of the hardest-hitting Christian rap groups. "They've already got the message in the churches. And half of them are too stiff to jam anyway."

Lynch and his partner Barry Hogan, 20, are youth ministers at their Dallas church, though both admit to having done their share of "hard-core city living," including crime, before their religious awakening.

As P.I.D.'s they've released two albums, "Here We Are" and "Back to Back." Last year they performed more than 50 Christian-oriented live shows. And this year, says Hogan, "we got 30 gigs booked already," from Canada to Hawaii to Jamaica.

But P.I.D.'s real goal this year is to make a video and get it played on "Yo! MTV Raps." "We're not trying to burst into their world," Hogan says of the secular rappers.





Maple Leafs' owner Ballard dies

TORONTO (AP) — Harold Ballard, the inscible owner of the NHL's Toronto Maple Leafs, died Wednesday at age 56.

Ballard spent much of the last two years in and out of hospitals because of diabetes-related health problems. In July 1988, he underwent heart bypass surgery at Toronto General Hospital after being hospitalized twice in two months.

In January 1988, he had a heart attack while on vacation and spent almost a month in the Miami Heart Institute. In February 1986, Ballard spent 16 days in the hospital for prostate gland surgery.

Ballard, who also owned the Maple Leafs Gardens, was known for his cooperation with subjects ranging from his complaint that players were too highly paid and insufficiently motivated to his opposition to detente with the Soviet Union, especially its hockey teams. At one point, he threatened to bar a Soviet team from the Gardens for an exhibition match.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Kansas City right fielder Danny Tartabull was carried off the field prior to Wednesday night's game against Baltimore after hurting his leg.

Tartabull said he was waiting for a fly ball to come down during batting practice when he felt a sharp pain in his right calf.

ABC's new show is set in fast-paced world of Washington D.C. newsroom

ABC's new ensemble drama "Capital News," which begins in its regular time slot on Monday, April 16, focuses on the professional and private lives of reporters and editors at The Capital, a prominent Washington D.C. newspaper not unlike The Washington Post. The editor-in-chief, Jo-Jo Turner, is played by crusty Lloyd Bridges. His mild-mannered metro (city) editor, Clay Gibson (Michael Woods), manages a group of young reporters, including the newly arrived Anne McKenna (Helen Slater, who starred in "Supergirl") and her more experienced partner, Redmond Dunne (William Russ, who most recently played Roger Lococco on "Wiseguy"). Meanwhile, the staff under scheming national editor Edison King (Mark Blum) works on far-reaching political stories.

"It's not life or death — it's newspapers!" says Blum, who explains that all three "Capital News" producers come directly from either "St. Elsewhere" or "Hill Street Blues" — both sophisticated ensemble shows that dealt with the starker, riskier topics of medicine or crime.

"The tone of this show is more in our heads," Blum says. "It's less gritty."

But that doesn't mean that "Capital News" is any less topical, serious — or satirical — than its antecedents. Blum describes his character as being "despotic, a real button-down, never-loosens-his-necktie kind of guy." King is locked in an subtle power struggle with Gibson to eventually succeed the not-yet-ready-to-quit

Turner. "My character and his wife (played by Catherine Parks in future episodes) are already planning how to redecorate Jo-Jo's office and who to invite to our celebratory ascension dinner," says Blum.

Gibson, on the other hand, is a rolled-up sleeves kind of guy. Blum says that a rivalry such as the one between King and Gibson is only natural for a newspaper based in Washington, D.C. Every story that takes place in Washington is, in a sense, both a national and metro story," he explains. "Half the people who are in the diplomatic corps live in Washington, as well as all the national politicians. The Capital is their hometown newspaper."

To research his role, Blum spent time with Bob Kaiser, the national editor of The Washington Post. (Co-executive producer Christian Williams was also a Washington Post editor for 15 years, and the huge open Capital newsroom set is modeled on the Washington Post's.) "Kaiser is a fine man, very smart and very much a help to me," says Blum. "There are

certain resemblances between (Kaiser) and my character, but I sincerely don't mean the unflattering part."

Blum's character indeed has quite the serio-comic edge. "He was bred to be an editor. Father in the diplomatic corps. A copy boy at 16. Harvard," Blum says. As career-oriented as he is, Edison King is shown having a home life. "He's not always at home," laughs Blum. "He's occasionally in a hot tub somewhere." Edison King's "mistress," though, is his wife. "My character's wife is also a careerist. We're Mr. and Mrs. Macbeth. The relationship is totally sexual. The lust for sex and the lust for power is intertwined, as it was for the Macbeths."

Soap opera scene

Soap opera addicts like to laugh too

Laughter in the daytime! Don't be funny. Soap opera addicts may laugh with highly overwrought characters, but never at them.

That is until Brad Sanders, a black standup comic from Chicago, came along. Working at night, Sanders watched soap operas while thinking up jokes and soon pulled laughs at night from his satirical views of the soap world. Nobody cared until Sanders' version of "All My Children" hit the radio waves.

ABC promptly sued Sanders, for nobody makes fun of soaps. But Brad had discovered his hook and soon his radio synopsis of "The Young and the Restless," known as "The Clarence Update," caught on. So did "On the Phone with Ti-Rone," a three-minute jive-talking "Dear Abby" show with Sanders the street shrink.

Recently, CBS got the message: Since Sanders was pulling in soap fans via radio, why not sign the man and let him make fun of network soaps. Call it CBS Soap Central.

Fans dial a 900 number and Clarence will answer with a weekly run-down on "As the World Turns," "The Bold and the Beautiful," "Guiding Light," and "The Young and the Restless."

In operation for two months, CBS Central appears to be clicking, particularly after on-the-air ads. "The Clarence Update" and "On the Phone with Ti-Rone" deliver the radio power. Brad Sanders is making waves with funny rewrites. Tune it. He's often better than the soaps themselves.

Besides, there's lots to laugh about. On "The Young and the Restless," Jeanne Cooper's Kay is kidnapped, but husband Rex can't tell the difference between his beloved Kay and Marge, a lusty look-a-like who is filling in. On "The Bold and the Beautiful," Eric Forrester has fallen in love with son Ridge's former fiancée, Brooke. A pregnant Brooke runs off because Eric won't tell off his witch of a wife, Stephanie.

With radio and TV access, Sanders has his own little niche satirizing the soaps. Nobody thought of this before, sensing the power of

the network. But such is the rivalry for ratings, CBS took advantage of Sanders while ABC huffed and puffed, pretending to be indignant. The ABC suit with Sanders has been settled. Sanders won't comment on the figures, but he's very pleased — and happy to be working.

Signed to a CBS development deal, the man is pitching sitcom ideas using film, not videotape. He learned this performing on "Frank's Place," the superior sitcom on life in a black New Orleans restaurant. "That was a wonderful show," says Brad. "Shooting on film, you sensed atmosphere. Part of that came from the lighting. I realized lighting a show correctly is often just as important as acting or writing."

As for figuring out network thinking, Sanders just shakes his head. Why CBS kept moving "Frank's Place" around, or

scheduling it against Monday Night Football, is beyond him.

"One network sues me, another hires me for the same thing," Sanders concludes. "Life is crazy."

Casting notes: Three soap stars whose faces are familiar have joined "The Bold and the Beautiful." Brian Patrick Clarke is Storm Logan, a lawyer who is the eldest of the Logan children.

Robert Clary plays Pierre Jourdan, the owner of the cabaret who proves to be a good friend to Brooke Logan. And Todd McKee will arrive on the scene later this month as Jake MacLaine, Margo Linley Spencer's ambitious brother. The trio of good actors should spark things on "B&B."

ABC's highly acclaimed 'Twin Peaks' fails to top NBC's good solid lineup

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Despite high marks for the premiere of ABC's highly touted, offbeat drama "Twin Peaks" and a lot of college basketball hoopla from CBS, NBC still won the latest Nielsen ratings race, according to figures released Tuesday.

The two-hour debut of film director David Lynch's "Twin Peaks" which chronicles sex, violence, junk food and power in a small Washington state lumber town ranked fifth for the week ended April 8, the A.C. Nielsen Co. reported.

It was followed by Monday night's showdown between the University of Nevada-Las Vegas and Duke University for the NCAA basketball crown. Although the game hardly ranked as drama, with Las Vegas routing the Blue Devils 103-73, viewers obviously were attracted to the matchup of strait-laced Duke and Jerry Tarkanian's glitter city Rebels.

Back-to-back episodes on ABC Sunday night of "America's Funniest Home Videos" grabbed the No. 1 spot and tied with NBC's "Cheers" for second place. Fourth spot was picked up by "The Bill Cosby Show."

It's 'Saturday morning live' for kids

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC, facing Saturday kid-show competition from cable as well as syndicated series, unveiled a fall schedule on Monday that includes what the network says is the most live-action Saturday programming in its history.

The new roster moves NBC away from the traditional cartoons that for years have been a staple of Saturday morning network shows for children.

NBC, which trails ABC by a full ratings point in Saturday morning ratings to date for this season, said its new lineup has two hours of shows with no animation and one hour of shows that mix animation with human characters.

The latter includes its new rap music comedy, "Kid 'n' Play." ABC has a similar rap music show set for next fall, "The New Kids on the Block," starring the rock group of the same name.

NBC's schedule, which one NBC official said was designed "to reach the kids of the 90s," was shown at a meeting of advertising agency officials here.

The network's shift from cartoons comes at a time when the three major networks, in addition to cable and syndicated competition, also face a three-hour Saturday morning schedule that the Fox network will

start next fall.

NBC, which began its move from cartoons this season with a new sitcom for kids, "Saved by the Bell," has five new series on its Saturday morning schedule for next fall, compared to three on ABC.

CBS, currently third in Saturday morning ratings as well as in prime time and in morning programs, will unveil its fall children's schedule Tuesday.

NBC's new live-action lineup includes a sports show for teen-agers and older viewers, "Inside Stuff: The Entertainment Magazine of the NBA." It will premiere Oct. 27 and lead into NBC's National Basketball Association broadcasts.

The other new live-action series are "The Boys Next Door," a variety series "secretly" broadcast by five teen-agers from the basement of their home in Encino, Calif., and "Saturday Videos," a children's version of NBC's pop-culture "Friday Night Videos."

NBC's new cartoon series include "Rick Moranis in Graveyard High," which features the voice and cartoon face of the star of "Honey, I Shrunk the Kids." The show is about a kindly teacher at a school where the students are literally minsters.

It's 'Saturday morning live' for kids

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC, facing Saturday kid-show competition from cable as well as syndicated series, unveiled a fall schedule on Monday that includes what the network says is the most live-action Saturday programming in its history.

The new roster moves NBC away from the traditional cartoons that for years have been a staple of Saturday morning network shows for children.

NBC, which trails ABC by a full-ratings point in Saturday morning ratings to date for this season, said its new lineup has two hours of shows with no animation and one hour of shows that mix animation with human characters.

The latter includes its new rap music comedy, "Kid 'n' Play." ABC has a similar rap music show set for next fall, "The New Kids on the Block," starring the rock group of the same name.

NBC's schedule, which one NBC official said was designed "to reach the kids of the 90s," was shown at a meeting of advertising agency officials here.

The network's shift from cartoons comes at a time when the three major networks, in addition to cable and syndicated competition, also face a three-hour Saturday morning schedule that the Fox network will

start next fall.

NBC, which began its move from cartoons this season with a new sitcom for kids, "Saved by the Bell," has five new series on its Saturday morning schedule for next fall, compared to three on ABC.

CBS, currently third in Saturday morning ratings as well as in prime time and in morning programs, will unveil its fall children's schedule Tuesday.

NBC's new live-action lineup includes a sports show for teen-agers and older viewers, "Inside Stuff: The Entertainment Magazine of the NBA." It will premiere Oct. 27 and lead into NBC's National Basketball Association broadcasts.

The other new live-action series are "The Boys Next Door," a variety series "secretly" broadcast by five teen-agers from the basement of their home in Encino, Calif., and "Saturday Videos," a children's version of NBC's pop-culture "Friday Night Videos."

NBC's new cartoon series include "Rick Moranis in Graveyard High," which features the voice and cartoon face of the star of "Honey, I Shrank the Kids." The show is about a kindly teacher at a school where the students are literally monsters.
