Profits go sky-high at banks

Profits at Idaho banks rose 66 percent last year, while income at banks across the U.S. dropped 34 percent, according to a report.

Idaho bank profits rose at the fifth-highest rate in the nation last year. Based on actual earnings, Idaho banks ranked 36th.

The state's 23 banks earned a total of \$87.8 million in 1989, up from \$52.9 million in the previous year, according to figures Sheshunoff Information Services Inc. in Austin, Texas, obtained by The Associated Press.

"The No. 1 factor in 1989 was the relatively robust economy, particularly the favorable commodity prices that we experienced," J. Patrick McMurray, chief executive officer of First Security Bank of Idaho, told the A.S. First Security is Idaho's second-largest bank.

In contrast, bank income nationwide plummeted from \$24 billion in 1988 to \$15.8 billion last year as banks struggled with weakening real estate markets, according to Sheshunoff.

Earlier this month Sheshunoff said Idaho-based savings and loans made \$1.6 million in 1989, while U.S. thrifts reported a record \$19 billion loss.

The strong performance by Idaho banks was dominated by four institutions — West One, First Security, First Interstate Bank of Idaho and Key Bank of Idaho. Those four control about 80 percent of bank assets in the state, said Belton Patty, director of the Idaho Department of Finance.

The strongest showing was by Key Bank of Idaho where book-keeping adjustments left over from a 1988 buy-out produced an inflated return on assets of 2.1 percent in 1989. Vice President Eldon Crockett told the AP.

"We'd like to be earning 2.1, but something more realistic for 1989 would be 1.21 to 1.26," Crockett said.

That would put Farmers National Bank of Bull in the No. 1 spot, with an ROA of 1.5 percent. Agriculture's strength was the reason.

"So goes the bank as goes the ag economy," President Ron Brown said.

FNB's net income was up 17 percent to \$795,000 from \$675,000.

In Burley, the locally owned D.L. Evans Bank enjoyed prosperous years as well. Vice President Marvin Lentini said. Net income rose 33 percent in 1989 to \$554,000 from \$416,000, he said.

Total assets of Idaho's banks were \$8.28 billion at the end of last year, which put the state in 45th place out of 50 states and the District of Columbia.

And the state's return on assets — a performance measure computed by dividing net income by total assets — was 1.14 percent, the ninth-best JOA in the nation, Sheshunoff said.

The U.S. ROA was 0.5 percent. An ROA of 1 percent is considered a strong performance.

D.L. Evans Bank had an average ROA of 1.41 percent in 1989, Lentini said. 1988's ROA was also good — 1.3 percent.

Most banks in Idaho ran into trouble in the mid-1980s when depressed farm prices caused many agricultural borrowers to walk away from their loans. Some of the rural banks in the state still are struggling to recover, Patty said.

Idaho State Bank in Glenns Ferry had one of the worst ROAs in the state — a minus 2.48 percent. Two former executives were convicted earlier this month of illegally using bank funds for personal expenses prior to 1988.

The bank posted \$1.1 million loss in 1989, but President James Kevan said Thursday that the bank has made money so far in 1990.

"We're in the black and we've got a great future ahead of us," Kevan said. "We know we're going to show a profit this year."

Vandalism wave keeps police busy

TWIN FALLS — Vandals shot out more than 30 car windows all over town Wednesday night, according to police.

Officers completed reports of 35 broken car windows by Thursday afternoon, Sgt. Jim Milton said, for a loss of about \$3,500.

At least one business had its windows broken as well. "We're going to look like the Bronx for a while, all boarded up, and that's sad for Twin Falls," said David Hutchins, owner of 2nd Time Around, a used furniture store.

Hutchins said his windows have been broken out four times in the last three months. While he waits for replacement safety glass, he must board up two of his windows at night.

According to police reports, someone used a BB or air-pellet gun Wednesday night and early Thursday morning to shoot out windows on cars parked on Alumnus Drive, Ridgeway Drive,

10th Avenue East, Shoup Avenue East and Meadows Lane, among other streets.

"Vandalism isn't necessarily unusual, but to have a streak of it is," Director of Public Safety Paul Du Fresno said.

Juveniles are responsible, he said, and officers working the case think one small group of kids is responsible for Wednesday night's streak and other recent incidents.

They took one child into custody and are following up other leads, Du Fresno said.

Hutchins is offering a \$300 reward to anyone who can provide information leading to the arrest and conviction of the culprits who broke out his windows.

"They'll be hard to catch unless the public comes forward to report suspicious activity," he said.

Hutchins has owned his store on Washington Street North for 24 years, he said, and has never had a problem with vandalism until recently.

"It's discouraging," he said.

Trade relations will be normalized with USSR

WASHINGTON — The United States and the Soviet Union reached basic agreement Thursday on an economic pact that would normalize trade relations between the two superpowers for the first time in nearly a half-century, a senior U.S. negotiator announced.

U.S. Deputy Trade Representative Julius Katz said he expected the agreement would be ready for signing at the May 30-June 3 summit between President Bush and Soviet

President Mikhail S. Gorbachev. The agreement would clear the way for the Soviet Union to obtain significantly lower tariffs on its products sold in America while expanding opportunities for U.S. companies to do business in the Soviet Union.

U.S. officials have predicted that trade between the two countries could double or even triple over the next three years with a new trade agreement. Private economists doubt that assessment, given the numerous troubles plaguing the Soviet econ-

omy. Last year, trade between the countries totaled \$5 billion. U.S. export sales, which totaled \$4.3 billion, reflected primarily grain shipments. Soviet sales in this country, totaling \$703 million, included petroleum and consumer items such as vodka and fur.

Mikhail Gorbachev and Gorbachev both made a new trade accord a top priority at their Malta summit meeting last December, conclusion of the pact had been jeopardized by the So-

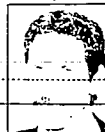
Colombian candidate dies after gun battle on airborne jetliner

BOGOTA, Colombia — A man on a suicide mission pulled out a submachine gun on a crowded Colombian jetliner Thursday and assassinated a presidential candidate before dying himself in a blaze of pistol fire from bodyguards.

A drug trafficking group called the Extraditables claimed responsibility for shooting former leftist guerrilla chief Carlos Pizarro and said his name was picked in a drawing, the radio network Caracol said.

The group, mainly from the

Medellin cocaine cartel, said other candidates will be killed until traffickers are pardoned.

Pizarro was the fourth Colombian presidential candidate to be assassinated the past 31 months. Drug traffickers were blamed in all four deaths.

An anonymous telephone caller said the names of three other presi-

dential candidates were in the death lottery and that another candidate will die.

Passengers screamed and ducked down in their seats as shooting broke out eight minutes after the Avianca Airlines Boeing 727 left Bogota's El Dorado International airport, the pilot, Capt. Fabio Munevar, said.

The plane, en route to the Caribbean coastal city of Barranquilla, where Pizarro was to campaign, returned immediately to Bogota.

Contra rebels gather at El Destino, refuse to hand over their weapons

Contras refuse to disarm

El DESTINO, Nicaragua — On a sun-baked slope, hundreds of Contras rebels listened to an aide of President-elect Violeta Barrios de Chamorro telling them to lay down their weapons.

But the attitude among Contras outside this mountain-humlet-recalled U.S. Gen. George McArthur's famous World War II response to a German general's invitation to surrender.

"Nuts," the rebels replied Wednesday — in loosely translated Spanish invective — to their earlier agreement to disarm when Mrs. Chamorro was inaugurated.

Others met the appeal by the Chamorro aide, Roberto Ferrey, with silence and stares.

The rebels laughed when Israel Galcano, one of 12 rebel chiefs standing at the bottom of the hill, asked "anybody who wants to give up his rifle, come forward." He said would be the last handing over his gun.

"When one shouted, 'Nobody gives up his gun!' all cheered and applauded."

The rebels are angered and alienated by Mrs. Chamorro's concessions to the leftist Sandinistas, which allow them to keep command of the army.

"We're prepared to hand over our weapons only

'Octane cheating' bilks drivers of millions each year

WASHINGTON — Some service stations pass off regular gasoline as higher-priced super premium, according to a congressional study Thursday that said "octane cheating" may be costing motorists \$150 million a year.

The report by the General Accounting office estimated that 9 percent of gasoline sold nationwide is mislabeled by half an octane number or more. And in several states where pump testing has "recently" proven "mislabeling," the federal government has done little to stop the deception, the report said.

The GAO, the investigative arm of Congress, said motorists who think they are

buying premium grades may be losing \$150 million a year.

But Rep. Philip R. Sharp, D-Ind., who along with Rep. Charles Schumer, D-N.Y., released the report, said the study was conservative and losses could reach as high as \$600 million through growing mislabeling of octane ratings at the pump.

Sharp's estimate is based partly on the fact that the GAO said that more than half the samples taken in two large cities last year — Detroit and St. Louis — were found to have octane ratings an average of 2.2 or more points below what was posted on the pump.

"Unfortunately, consumers' cannot determine octane ratings visually or in other ways

that allow them to know if they are getting what they are paying for," the GAO said.

Federal law requires that uniform yellow and black labels on gas pumps show the octane rating of gas, and some higher-powered vehicles recommend various levels of octane to avoid that unhealthy "ping" or knocking sound in engines.

A low octane gas can reduce engine efficiency, mileage and emissions, in high-powered engines, the GAO said.

Regular unleaded gas is rated at 87, with mid-range unleaded at 89 and premium grades from 91 to 94. Regular leaded gas is rated at 89.

The difference in retail price between the

lowest and highest grade can range up to 20 cents a gallon.

"A consumer could be paying several cents a gallon extra for quality that is not delivered," said Sharp, who is chairman of the House Energy and Commerce subcommittee on energy and power.

Sharp said he would introduce legislation to give states more enforcement power over octane cheating.

The report said inspectors found in several states that some retail stations were selling gasoline from the same storage tank that was rated at different octane levels.

Arms control adviser resigns over haste in strategic talks

WASHINGTON (AP) — Edward L. Rowny quit Thursday as a senior arms control adviser to President Bush. Sources said Rowny resigned over what he felt was undue haste in completing a treaty with the Soviet Union to limit strategic nuclear missiles.

Bush accepted Rowny's resignation with "deep regret" and said he had always valued his adviser's candor and loyalty.

"You have served as one of the principal architects of the American policy of peace through strength," Bush said in a letter the 73-year-old, retired Army lieutenant general.

Rowny, who will leave his position June 30, said in a statement that he looked forward "to contributing to his (Bush's) efforts for peace through strength."

White House spokesman Martin Fitzwater said Rowny had authorized him to say there was no disagreement or reason to leave other than a desire to take the positions outside government.

But the sources, who spoke only on the condition of anonymity, said Rowny disagreed with Secretary of State James A. Baker III over Baker's pushing to complete the treaty as what Rowny felt was too fast a pace.

"He wanted to slow down START

(the Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty talks) before we give up too much," said a source outside the government and close to Rowny.

"He is saying, 'What's the rush?'"

The administration would like to conclude at least a framework agreement on the key START issues for initiating by Bush and Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev at their summit meeting that begins in Washington May 30.

"He is saying, by resigning, 'Why sacrifice the national security in a rush to get a glad hand and a smile from Gorbachev?'" the source said.

"He will now make that point as a private individual."

House committee votes to halve Salvador military aid, add conditions

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Foreign Affairs Committee voted Tuesday to cut U.S. military aid to El Salvador in half and to impose strict new conditions on the money.

On a voice vote, the Democratic-dominated panel moved to cut the \$85 million a year that the United States provides to help El Salvador's military. The action amended a bill that would authorize spending of emergency aid Bush wants this year for Nicaragua and Panama.

Congressmen expressing the Bush administration's opposition to the

move called it partisan and unwise, giving legitimacy to leftist rebels.

But supporters of the changes said the new conditions would encourage both the government and rebels to negotiate a peace agreement. It would be up to the president to decide whether the conditions have been met.

If the rebels of the Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front continue to receive weapons shipments from outside the country, thwart peace talks or mount a military offensive, the government's military aid would be restored. If the

Postal Service losing money, can't detect postage

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Postal Service is spending billions to automate its mail sorting system, but there is a blind spot in its high-tech equipment: The machines can't detect how much postage is on an envelope.

Schemers are exploiting this weakness by sending first-class letters with only pennies in postage and are even taking out ads to sell their "secret" postal savings plan for

"It can be done, no doubt about it, because of the mechanization," said David Fast, a postal inspector in Philadelphia.

Clerks used to examine each letter as it passed through the postal system. But since Postal Service automation began in 1981, machines cancel and sort up to nine letters a second, or more than 30,000 envelopes an hour.

While the machines will kick out a letter with no postage, they will send along a letter with as little as one cent in postage, Fast said.

Kohl, Mitterand urge Lithuania to accommodate Soviet Union

PARIS (AP) — President Francois Mitterand and West German Chancellor Helmut Kohl urged Lithuania on Thursday to meet Moscow's demands for a suspension of its independence drive.

Lithuanian lawmakers declared the republic independent March 11.

The letter said temporarily rescinding pro-independence laws "would take nothing away from their validity since they were taken under a universally accepted principle — the principle of the self-determination of peoples."

The letter was drafted during a two-day summit in which Kohl and Mitterand discussed a wide range of issues. It came two days after President Bush refused to impose economic sanctions against the Soviet Union for its military and economic campaign against Lithuania.

In a letter, Mitterand and Kohl said Lithuanian President Vytautas Landsbergis should rescind pro-independence laws to clear the way for talks with the Kremlin, "so that the current crisis ends in a solution acceptable to all parties."

"Without doubt, it would facilitate the start of such talks to suspend temporarily the effects of decisions taken by your Parliament," the letter said.

Lithuania plans food rationing

MOSCOW (AP) — Lithuanian lawmakers decided today to impose food rationing on May 1 as the rebellious republic continued to struggle under an economic blockade that has reduced its supplies of fuel and medicine. Lithuania widened efforts to circumvent sanctions imposed last week by Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev, who wants Lithuania to rescind laws designed to implement its March 11 declaration of independence.

A Lithuanian delegation was due in the northern Russian city of Leningrad on Friday to talk with local officials about a direct exchange of goods either for hard currency or barter, a Leningrad journalist said. Prime Minister Kazimiera Prunskiene announced Wednesday that Lithuania had halted its usual supplies of meat, milk and other food products to the rest of the Soviet Union.

She instead urged Lithuania to settle accounts using bartering.

Vote delays hostage release

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — A radical Iranian newspaper said Thursday that a congressional resolution endorsing a united Jerusalem as the capital of Israel will delay the release of Western hostages in Lebanon.

Syria also denounced the resolution by the U.S. House of Representatives, saying it emphasized an American desire to "defy Arabs and Moslems by stealing their rights without any lawful or historical justification." Iran's daily Islamic Republic said

the congressional move "made things more complicated by blocking the way for solving problems."

Calling the resolution a deliberate snub to world Moslems, it suggested Washington does not want to save the seven Americans and 10 other Western hostages in captivity in Lebanon.

The hostage takers will "delay their release in a natural reaction," it said. Excerpts of the paper's commentary were carried by the Islamic Republic News Agency.

Shamir to form Israeli government

JERUSALEM (AP) — Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir, leader of the right-wing Likud bloc, was chosen Thursday to form a new government after the Labor Party leader failed in his attempt to forge what he called a peace coalition.

A Shamir-led government could spell trouble for U.S. efforts to arrange a Palestinian-Israeli dialogue, but Shamir could face as daunting a challenge as Labor's Shimon Peres did in finding coalition partners.

NATO may scrap nuclear missile

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — In the new atmosphere of reduced East-West tensions, the NATO alliance may end controversial plans to add a new short-range missile to its nuclear arsenal, sources said Thursday.

The North Atlantic Treaty Organization also could decide in the coming months to make cuts in its stockpile of nuclear artillery, said the sources, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

Assassination try was publicity move

BONN, West Germany (AP) — A mentally disturbed woman told prosecutors she tried to kill opposition politician Oskar Lafontaine because she wanted to "get in the news," a law enforcement official said Thursday.

Lafontaine, a Social Democrat and Chancellor Helmut Kohl's leading challenger in the December election, was in satisfactory condition at a Cologne hospital. He was stabbed in the neck with a butcher knife at a campaign rally Wednesday.

Jewish court orders settlers evicted

JERUSALEM (AP) — The Supreme Court on Thursday ordered the eviction of Jewish settlers who stirred an international protest by moving into a building in the Christian quarter of Jerusalem's old city.

Officials of the Greek Orthodox Church, which owns the building, were dissatisfied because the ruling allows maintenance workers and 20 guards hired by the settlers to remain until a lower court resolves the tenancy dispute.

U.S., Soviets end chemical parley

GENEVA (AP) — U.S. and Soviet negotiators today ended their latest round of talks on chemical weapons, and the Soviets said there would be no accord on destroying stockpiles unless the United States agrees to halt production.

Both sides said, however, that they hoped a draft accord could be signed at the Washington summit between Presidents Bush and Mikhail S. Gorbachev.

Soviets' protests recall Chernobyl

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviets joined widespread protests, a 24-hour telethon and a strike at a major factory Thursday to mark the fourth anniversary of the world's worst nuclear accident, the reactor explosion at Chernobyl.

It was the Soviet Union's biggest national commemoration of the 1986 disaster, and it followed years of state-encouraged passivity on the topic.

Texas towns evacuated as storms cause floods

DALLAS (AP) — More than 24 hours of thunderstorms caused flooding Thursday in Texas that brought out the National Guard to evacuate two towns and forced campers to the roofs of their vehicles. High wind damaged an Air Force base.

At least three people drowned in Texas and two were missing from the storms, which were photographed by space shuttle Discovery's astronaut orbiting 380 miles above Earth.

Flooding in nearby south-central Oklahoma also forced evacuations and closed highways.

The National Weather Service reported up to 15 inches of rain overnight in some areas of Texas as

storms carrying at least six tornadoes hop-scotched across the state.

"I have never seen it rain this hard. It's raining so hard that you can hardly see out," said Laura Gohl of Stephenville, southwest of Fort Worth, where more than 150 people waited out the storm in shelters overnight and into Thursday morning.

The Texas National Guard sent 35 people and 20 trucks to help evacuate people from Brownwood, southeast of Abilene, and Weatherford, just west of Fort Worth.

Police in Brownwood reported all major traffic routes under water, some waist deep.

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — Ground controllers cheered after re-establishing contact Thursday with the \$1.5 billion Hubble Space Telescope through its main antennas.

An attempt six hours earlier had failed.

"I'm pretty relieved, I must say," said Al Boggess, Hubble project scientist at Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Md.

Applause erupted at Goddard's Space Telescope Operations Control Center when the high-speed contact was made Thursday afternoon.

Controllers sent information to the telescope about its location, and "this basically improved the telescope's knowledge where it was, what its position was," said Goddard's Dave Drachlis.

They also widened the radio beam to cover a larger area around the two high-speed dish antennas.

The antennas are the primary communications links for relaying scientific information to the ground.

Inexperience was part of the problem, Boggess said.

Big Green move sweeping California

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Proponents of the so-called Big Green environmental initiative today said they were turning in more than twice as many signatures as needed to qualify the sweeping measure for the November ballot.

"Some 800,000 Californians have signed up to ban cancer-causing pesticides from our food, to protect our coast from oil drilling and tanker spills, to stop the dumping of sewage and industrial waste in the ocean, and to lead the fight against global warming," said Democratic gubernatorial candidate John Van de Kamp.

Marcos' blood pressure up in court

NEW YORK (AP) — Imelda Marcos' blood pressure soared Thursday, forcing a recess of her trial, after she heard testimony about the day she and her husband fled the Philippines with a "tremendous amount of jewels" and cash.

U.S. District Judge John E. Keenan adjourned the trial until Friday morning, provided the former Philippines first lady was able to testify.

Defense secretary wants plane cuts

WASHINGTON (AP) — Defense Secretary Dick Cheney on Thursday called for slashing Pentagon plans for the B-2 stealth bomber and other sophisticated aircraft, citing a diminishing Soviet threat.

Cheney, pressed by congressional Democrats to cut military spending in response to rapid changes in Europe, testified his blueprint would trim \$2.4 billion from President Bush's \$307 billion defense budget for 1991 and would save \$34.8 billion through 1997. In addition to cutting the proposed number of B-2 bombers from 132 to 75, Cheney said he intends to cut planned purchases of the C-17 long-range transport plane and the Navy's A-12 attack aircraft.

Court backs rights of mothers-to-be

WASHINGTON (AP) — A pregnant patient's decision to refuse medical treatment is almost always paramount, even when survival of a fetus is at stake, the District of Columbia's highest court ruled Thursday.

The decision in a widely watched case is binding only in the district, but it is expected to influence other courts wrestling with questions of maternal and fetal rights in connection with medical treatment and abortion. "We hold that in virtually all cases the question of what is to be done is to be decided by the patient — the pregnant woman — on behalf of herself and the fetus," the D.C. Court of Appeals said in a 7-1 decision.

Georgia governor defends officials

ATLANTA (AP) — Gov. Joe Frank Harris defended state mental health officials Wednesday in the case of a man who was released from a state mental hospital the day before he opened fire in a suburban shopping mall. One person was killed and four were wounded in Tuesday's attack.

James Calvin Brady, 31, had been released from Georgia Regional Hospital, a state psychiatric facility in Atlanta, on Monday.

Government must pay in Navy AIDS case

BOSTON (AP) — A Marine officer who caught the AIDS virus from his wife after she was fatally infected by a transfusion in a naval hospital, is entitled to damages from the government, a federal judge ruled Thursday.

U.S. District Judge Rya Zobel found the government negligent for the infections, which killed Matsuko Gaffney, and her son, John, even

though AIDS had not been identified as a disease when she was infected in 1981.

The judge ordered a second trial to determine damages for Chief Warrant Officer Martin Gaffney and his daughter, Maureen, who sued the government for \$55 million two years ago.

Maureen, who is 6, is the only family member not infected by the

virus.

"I'm not surprised at the ruling," Gaffney said. "I've maintained all along that that was the case. I'm just surprised it took this long for the decision."

"It's obviously very good news. I just wish my wife had heard this."

Polhill returns to U.S.

WASHINGTON — Flashing a broad smile and a jaunty thumbs-up, Robert Polhill on Thursday came home to the United States and said simply, "I'm very happy, very happy."

Polhill, 55, a former accountant from New York who was held hostage for 39 months in Lebanon, stepped off a military jet at Andrews Air Force Base in suburban Maryland to a low-key welcome from several dozen well-wishers.

He appeared gaunt and tired, but grinned and waved several times before he and his wife Cheryl ducked into a government limousine for the ride to Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington. Doctors plan to perform several days of tests on Polhill, a diabetic who lost 25 pounds in captivity.

Polhill is expected to meet with President Bush next week and then head home to Fishkill, N.Y., where his mother, Ruth, and a welcoming parade await him.

Fishkill Mayor George Carter said, "Everybody wants to pat his back, shake his hand and tell him how good it is he's free." But Carter said the town's yellow ribbons will stay up until the seven other Americans are free.

Polhill, a business professor at the American University in Beirut, was released Sunday, but hopes have dwindled that more Americans would be freed soon.

American children neglected

WASHINGTON — A federal commission Thursday painted a troubling portrait of America's children, saying that too many are reaching adulthood "unhealthy, illiterate, unemployable and lacking both moral direction and a vision of a secure future."

The National Commission on Children, releasing its interim report to the president and Congress, said that current realities "raise serious questions about the reach and effectiveness of existing public and private sector policies and programs to support children and their families."

Calling children "the poorest group in America," the commission said that one out of every five children is living in poverty — in urban areas one of every three — and that too many children are entering school unprepared to learn.

Further, the report said, the nation's health care policies have "harsh and dire consequences" for children. It noted that an estimated 10.6 million children, or 19 percent, lack health insurance. The panel also said that drug and alcohol use by parents, as well as drug-related crime and violence, are as much a threat to children as the use of drugs by children themselves.

Taken together, "this is a personal tragedy for the young people involved and a staggering loss for the nation as a whole," said Sen. Jay Rockefeller, D-W. Va., commission chairman. "The health and vitality of our economy and our democracy are in danger."

Playboy Channel interrupted by church message

WASHINGTON (AP) — A television technician was charged with federal criminal violations Thursday for allegedly interrupting the satellite transmission of a pornography television show with religious messages.

Thomas M. Haynie, a technician for the Christian Broadcast Network in Virginia Beach, Va., was accused of using his employer's satellite transmission equipment to break into transmissions of a program called "American Ecstasy" on the Playboy cable television channel, the Justice Department said.

A department news release described the interrupted cable broadcast as "a hard-core pornography show." The program was interrupted three times on Sept. 6, 1987, with the video message: "Thus saith the Lord thy God, Remember the sabbath and keep it holy. Repent, the kingdom of God is at hand!"

Clinic gives oral contraceptives to women over 35

TWIN FALLS—A family planning clinic operated by a government agency is handing out oral contraceptives to women over 35 and giving contraceptive intrauterine devices to women, a nurse from the local health department says.

Marlene Sackett, women's health care specialist for the local Family Planning Clinic of the South-Central District Health Department, said the services are the result of a new product and new scientific evidence.

Until the last few months, the clinic did not give oral contraceptives to women over 35 because it was considered a cardiovascular risk, Sackett said.

Sackett said the federal Food and Drug Administration's Maternal Health Drugs

Advisory Committee recently concluded that women over 35 who use oral contraceptives are only at risk if they smoke or have certain diseases like diabetes and hypertension.

The committee also said that previous experience with increased cardiovascular risks to oral contraceptive users was related to pills that are no longer available.

Kate Ruddon, spokesperson for the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists in Washington, D.C., said in a telephone interview that the college has found no conclusive evidence that pills pose any increased risk to healthy women over 35.

"We've been saying that for quite some time," Ruddon said.

The clinic also recently began giving women copper IUDs that are much safer than the Dalkon Shield, Sackett said. The

Dalkon Shield, a widely used intrauterine device of the 1970s and early 1980s, was found to cause health problems for users. The device is no longer sold or manufactured.

"It's not as dangerous as the one before," Sackett said.

Sackett said the clinic does offer tests for infections and does a lifestyle screening for "sexually active" women.

Although the IUDs are not well suited for women who have several different sex partners, they pose no problems for women with stable relationships, she said.

Despite the contention by anti-abortion advocates, who say the IUD is an abortion device, Sackett pointed to studies showing that copper IUDs primarily prevent fertilization.

Ruddon said a second function of IUDs are to prevent a fertilized egg from

attaching itself to the uterine wall.

"It is controversial," she said.

Sackett said the health district's Twin Falls clinic serves about 150 women a month.

The clinic offers birth control counseling for women and children 14 years old and over. Although 14-year-old girls can receive birth control without parental consent, the clinic shows films and gives individual counseling, Sackett said.

"It helps them decide what they want and it's kind of a values clarification for them," she said.

Sackett said she has seen only four or five girls who have not already been sexually active, and most girls are at least 16 or 17.

Clients are charged on a sliding fee schedule according to their income, she said.

Murtaugh schools seek \$76,000 override levy

MURTAUGH—The school district here will ask voters next month for another \$76,000 override levy to help run the district and for future needs.

Voters also will also cast ballots in the May 15 election for the Zone 1 and 4 seats.

As of Thursday afternoon, incumbent Brent Stastny had turned in a petition in Zone 1. Pat Funk and Doug Rovig are signed up for the Zone 4 seat held by Georgina

Wolverton, who is not seeking re-election.

Today is the last day to return petitions for running for the seats.

The \$76,000 levy, if approved, will help pay for needed building and curriculum improvements as well as help fund a new school bus, Superintendent Frederick Diaz-Granados said.

Taxes won't rise if the levy is approved, since taxpayers last year ratified a levy of the same amount, Diaz-Granados said.

"The board decided last year to try and keep the override roughly the same so there

were no ups and downs," he said.

Diaz-Granados said that some of the levy monies will be marked to buy new books and make some building improvements, although those haven't been unidentified.

The district will set aside \$25,000 for a new school bus.

Diaz-Granados estimates the total cost for the bus, which will be purchased a year from now, to be around \$35,000.

The board hopes the \$10,000 difference will come from the district's share of lottery money, Diaz-Granados said.

The levy also will provide some surplus monies which will carry the district through the summer.

"It's important to maintain that surplus so we don't have to pay interest," he said.

The tentative 1990-91 budget calls for \$911,000 and total revenues are projected to be \$843,000, leaving a deficit of \$68,000.

Rolling for Twin Falls County residents will be at Murtaugh City Hall, and, for Cassia County, at the Ray Hepworth residence, 4745 E. 2099 N.

City Park fountain will depict Twin Falls 100 years ago

TWIN FALLS—Although the Snake River no longer spills over the Twin Falls in a double cascade, visitors to City Park will soon get a good idea what it looked like 100 years ago.

A ground-breaking ceremony for the "Centennial Fountain" — to be located at the lava rock pile near the band shell — is set for 10 a.m. Monday at City Park.

"A lot of people come to the valley to see the falls," said Twin Falls Mayor Tom Condie. "But they can be dry and they can see only one of the falls now. I think it will really be something to have this kind of fountain in the park that will depict what the falls did and would have looked like if the water was all still coming over."

One of the two waterfalls at the site was diverted to generate electrical power, leaving a single cascade that does not run year-round.

The brainchild of Twin Falls resident Howard Allen, the city fountain will be built between the lower and upper parts of the lava rock pile in City Park and will spill into a man-made pond.

The water from the pond will be recycled back through the 1,000-gallon holding tank.

And a pump system will continuously push about 200 gallons of water a minute up one of two side pillars into a trough and over the edge.

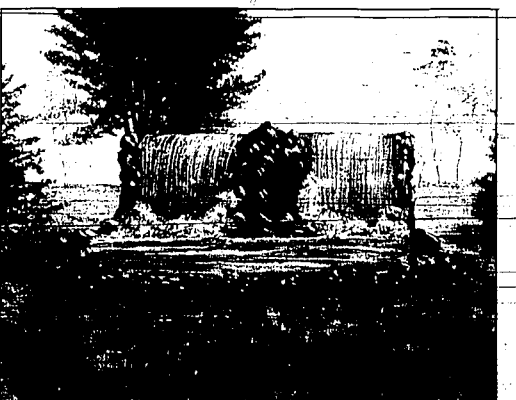
A concrete sidewalk or patio area and landscaping will surround the rock pile.

"It's not going to disturb the area too much," Condie said. "But I think it will be a refreshing."

The fountain will face Shoshone Street, with a large concrete, metal and stone monument standing guard in front. The monument — an outline of Idaho with the Centennial insignia marking Twin Falls — will be mounted in a berm and be visible from the street, Condie said.

"We really had nothing to mark the Centennial," he said. "This will be something that will sit for another 100 years and remind us of our past."

The city will pay a portion of the total bill with a Gem State Communities grant. Idaho Power Co. and First Federal Savings Bank are donating cash while other local businesses and craftsmen such as Kimberly Nurseries and Landscaping Service, Jerry Young, K&T Steel Corp., architect Roger Lushkin, Elrod Lilly, Co., Inc., Magic Valley Electric Supply, Sunset Memorial and Dan Edwards will donate time or materials.

Montana church still braced for bad news

CORWIN SPRINGS, Mont. — The bad karma of the past 25,800 years came down, but it wasn't bad enough to cause a nuclear war this week.

Members of the Church Universal and Triumphant believe they deserve some of the credit, having chanted through most of a day and night earlier this week to stave off doomsday, which church founder Elizabeth Clare Prophet had predicted for years could happen this month.

Citing an ominous planetary configuration and her own apocalyptic visions, Prophet warned that March and April would be particularly dangerous. The warning attracted thousands of church members to southwestern Montana. Many built fallout shelters.

Prophet had said that on April 23, the bad karma of all those thousands of years would begin to catch up with us, commencing a 12-year dark cycle. "It's just the first day—of thousands of days," said church member Vivien Mason.

Now that the immediate crisis is over, the church may find that a dark cycle has indeed descended upon it here in the high ranch country of Montana.

The relationship between the church and local people, which has never been good, got worse when the church reported two weeks ago that fuel had leaked from underground storage tanks and contaminated a stream.

Because the church has closed its doors to the community, few know much about what goes on at the big

blue barn at the church-owned Royal Teton Ranch or in its two nearby subdivisions.

What the people of Gardiner and Livingston, the two closest towns, do know about the 2,000 to 3,000 members of the church is this: They build bomb shelters, eat macrobiotic food and wear purple on Thursdays. They talk about the stars and Jesus and Buddha and some guy with a turban named El Morya all in the same breath. They buy guns to protect their shelters, they spend hours chanting fast-forward prayers or "decrees," and Elizabeth Clare Prophet, known as "Guru Ma," is a nice-looking woman of 51 who wears a lot of makeup.

Prophet and her church members say their religion is nobody's business.

Complaints about the church's use of the land, Prophet believes, are a smokescreen for the real objections. "As long as they look at me and the church as a bunch of freaks, there is not going to be harmony and understanding," Prophet says. "They have to come to the understanding that people can be different and still be OK."

Locals point to the damage to the high mountain clearing where the church's huge shelter was dug out of the earth. Cleanup crews are now trying to protect Mol Herox Creek from what remains of more than 31,000 gallons of spilled fuel.

"Freethinking," says Gardiner resident Betty DeWeese — that sounds just like Montanans. "We can't even get the town incorporated because we have so many free thinkers here," says DeWeese.

Boise: The city without a homicide squad

BOISE — The District of Columbia is not the only American city on a record-setting homicide binge. Yet not only here is panicking. The murder tally for 1990 is one, compared with zero in 1989, when Idaho's capital had the lowest murder rate of any city in the country.

"If you get the right mix of people that makes a big difference," police Chief James J. Carvino said. "It doesn't matter what race, creed or color they are. It's how they feel about violence and community life."

Carvino, who arrived here 14 months ago, knows something about violence. Before he served a three-year stint in the mid-1980s as head of the 4,300-member U.S. Capitol Police force, he spent 22 years with the New York Police Department, advancing from rookie patrolman walking a beat in Hell's Kitchen to captain in charge of narcotics investigations in Brooklyn and Staten Island.

Last year, the District of Columbia tallied 438 murders and New York 1,905. Boise does not even have a homicide squad. Of 189 metropolitan areas with populations of at

least 100,000, Boise last year also had the fewest robberies, 37, and second-fewest stolen vehicles, 220. Adjusted for population differences, the city's crime rate is equally low compared with other U.S. cities, according to the FBI's Uniform Crime Report.

"It really is a useful selling tool," said Grant Jones of the Boise Convention and Visitors Bureau. "We can say with real confidence that, if a person brings a group or a family to Boise, they're going to be very safe. The chance of anything happening to them is pretty slim."

In part, cynical Eastern urbanites may suggest, that is because not much happens in Boise, for good or ill. The city is largely white-collar, with an economy wrapped around state government and a value system influenced by the Mormon church. Residents love in camping, fishing, skiing, families. Living is easy and inexpensive; the local newspaper lists a six-bedroom, five-bathroom house with a tennis court for \$139,900. Parenting magazine, which cited Boise last month as one of the top 10 U.S. cities for raising children, called it "a town that time forgot."

"Geography is another reason for

the low-crime rate," Carvino said. "You have to drive 4½ hours to get to the next major city, which would be Salt Lake. You have to want to come to Boise to be here. Not many people are just passing through."

For the most part, Boise also has been bypassed by the wave of hard drugs that sent murder rates soaring in other cities. "Our narcotics guys keep saying, 'What is it coming?'" Carvino said. "We talk to people in Portland, Spokane, Coeur d'Alene, Salt Lake. So we know it's around. You can't say that crack will never come here or that we'll never have problems. But I'll tell you one thing: If we see any problems, we're going to move quickly."

Boise is hardly Shangri-La. Although burglary and larceny also declined last year, rape and arson increased by more than one-third. Over the last five years, this city of 112,000 residents has averaged two murders annually.

Like many states, Idaho's prison population is soaring. One county sheriff — frustrated that the overcrowded state penitentiary last month refused to make room for a convicted child molester, handcuffed the prisoner to a fence outside the prison gate. Here in Ada County,

voters recently rejected a \$20 million bond issue to expand the local jail.

Carvino, who commands 160 officers and 40 civilians, has proposed expanding the force by 50 people. That, he believes, is prudent planning to preserve the quality of life in a city that is growing rapidly and "always has plenty to keep you busy — the traffic problems, the accidents, the eat in a tree."

Son of a Brooklyn longshoreman, Carvino lied about his age at 16 to enlist in the Navy, serving on three submarines during the Korean War. After working his way through the ranks of the NYPD, he retired because "I wanted to be a chief." He got his wish in Racine, Wis., for eight years, until being selected from a field of 100 applicants to head the U.S. Capitol Police in 1984.

His relations soured with the governing Capitol Police Board, composed of the House and Senate sergeants-at-arms and the Capitol architect. Carvino said he was chastised for asking Capitol Police employees to help make a seven-minute videotape, which he sent as a retirement gift to a former secretary in Wisconsin. He resigned in June 1987.

Booby trap suspect charged, faces no jail time

DENVER (AP) — A man who was beset by burglaries and rigged a shotgun booby trap that killed an intruder in his warehouse will get a deferred sentence for reckless manslaughter under a plea bargain announced Thursday.

Philip Connaghan, 46, will spend no time in jail and his record will be cleared of the conviction if he has no further run-ins with the law, Denver District Attorney Norm Early said.

The deal is subject to approval by a judge, who does not have the option of accepting the guilty plea alone and imposing a sentence

where none is recommended, Early said.

Early said he decided to file a felony charge of reckless manslaughter and a misdemeanor charge of violating the state's booby-trap law because the facts failed to support filing first- or second-degree murder charges. Connaghan will plead guilty to the charges under the agreement.

"Philip Connaghan, an otherwise law-abiding citizen ... knowingly stepped beyond the lawful means of protecting property because of the severe frustration created by

repeated victimization," Early said. Michael McComb, 19, was killed by a blast from a 12-gauge shotgun on April 14 after he and three juveniles broke into the warehouse that Connaghan rented.

The three youths, who have been released into their parents' custody, face possible burglary charges.

Connaghan, who was in Kansas on vacation when McComb was killed, surrendered on April 20 and was released on \$5,000 bond Monday.

Under the plea bargain, Early will

recommend that Connaghan be given a deferred sentence and be required to perform community service.

If the judge rejects the agreement, Early said his office would have to consider new charges. Connaghan was pleased with Early's decision, said Connaghan's lawyer, Bob Ransome. Connaghan will not comment until it is resolved, Ransome said. Before the April 14 killing, the warehouse had been burglarized six times.

Idaho woman becomes the 1st black Playboy Playmate of Year

BOISE (AP) — A Boise woman, who achieved her goal of being a Playmate of the Month last fall, has reached another benchmark — Playmate of the Year.

Renee High School graduate, is the first black winner of the annual title to be announced Thursday by the men's magazine.

Ms. Tenison, who has a black father and a white mother, said "I don't think of myself as black or white." She will be featured in the June issue, on newstands next Wednesday. She was chosen by the Playmate staff, with the final nod from Playboy founder Hugh Hefner.

Ms. Tenison, employed by a Boise electronics company, has done local modeling, including TV commercials and catalog photos, in addition to posing for Playboy.

Magazine spokesman Bill Farley said, "The bottom line is, there's no reason not to."

Miss America Debbye Turner and Miss USA Carole Gist also are black.

Their successes, along with appearances by black models in Sports Illustrated's 1990 swimsuit issue and on recent covers of Vogue, Mademoiselle and Mirabella, herald a breakthrough in the highly competitive, predominantly white beauty business.

Corporate spying is big business

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Corporate spies shun cloaks and daggers, and the midnight break-in is a no-no. These days, it helps to have an advanced tech degree and to know how to sniff out information from a computer.

As recently as a few years ago, most American corporations were satisfied to concentrate on researching their own markets and customers. But many find that knowing the competition thoroughly can help a company capitalize on its own strengths, shore up weak points, take advantage of opportunities and counter threats.

Corporate spying, until it was notorious relative to industrial espionage, is an honorable business with a written code of ethics, said Bob Margulies, competitive assessment manager for McDonnell Douglas Corp. in Long Beach, Calif., and new president of the society.

Corporate spies don't try to ferret out confidential information or bug meeting in their rivals' offices.

Rather, they rely on public information and interviews with experts.

"It is not glamorous work," said Margulies. "It is pure, unadorned research—the collecting data, interpreting that data and communicating to your management or customer."

In Japan, corporate spying is an old and respected custom. "The Japanese are the professionals," Herring said. "They're the ones who started it. They do it almost second nature. It's just part of their company."

Margulies said the Japanese "have honed their techniques for gathering and analyzing information to the point where they play it like an instrument like a musician."

"The information explosion of the past decade, fueled by more sophisticated computers and a proliferation of data banks and specialized publications, has enabled corporate spies to find out almost anything they want about competitors."

"You'd be very foolish to accept inside, confidential information," Margulies said. "It's unethical and it's illegal to use that information to gain a competitive advantage. It puts only you in jeopardy, it puts your company in jeopardy and puts your profession in jeopardy."

"Ninety-five percent of what you need is readily accessible. That additional five percent that you can't get legally is not going to help you that much. So why throw your career down the drain? Why embarrass your company. It's a no-no."

Baskin-Robbins strikes sweet deal with Soviets

Proficient pianists run in Aikele family

ARCO - Five miles west of here, the Aikele home sits on a windswept plain, Idaho's grandeur surrounding it. Outside, it's quiet, the kind of place where a body can think. But inside, the Aikele home is nearly always abuzz with the sounds of music and children's laughter.

The five Aikele children - Sam, 16; Jaime, 13; Jennifer, 11; Emily, 9; and Alison, 6 - are all accomplished pianists. They will travel from Arco (to Twin Falls Monday) for a concert to benefit the Twin Falls Music Club and its scholarship program.

The 7:30 p.m. concert is free, although donations for the scholarship program will be accepted after the show. Patrons can obtain free concert passes at the door or in advance at Judi's Bookstore, the Little Red Hen or any music store in Twin Falls.

All five children will play on the program, performing works by Chopin, Bartok, Ravel, Grieg, Prokofiev, Burgmuller, Liszt, Scriabin and Kabalevsky.

The Aikeles and their 30 mitty fingers will be here fresh from last weekend's music festival at the Utah State University where Sam and Jaime placed first in their age divisions.

Emily took second place in her division, even though she was the youngest in the age group. Alison played her way into the finals, too. Only Jennifer, who just had her tonsils out, didn't compete - but she's won her age division at the festival twice in previous years.

Winning major piano competitions is nothing new for the Aikele children; they've been doing it for years, traveling from Arizona to Arkansas, taking prestigious titles in events such as the Young Keyboard Artists' Competition and a national competition sponsored by Baldwin.

It's a heady life, but the children of Eric and Janet Aikele are pretty down to earth, despite a schedule that would try any family's resolve.

The four oldest kids get up at 4 a.m. to practice on one of the family's four pianos. Their only day off is Sunday.

Each weekend, they make a 400-mile round-trip to Logan, Utah, where they study with Gary Amano and Betty Beecher, piano professors at Utah State. Occasionally, says Janet, the family has thought of moving to Utah to be closer to the children's music activities, but the Aikeles are a long-standing fixture in Arco, where they farm and run the town's feed and fertilizer store.

Janet Aikele realized early on that Sam had musical talent when, at age 2, he'd climb beside her on the piano bench and started taking over. By age 4, he was being driven to Blackfoot for lessons.

Sam's sisters followed in his footsteps, beginning lessons at age 3. Now, the three oldest children are even teaching younger children how to play in a piano studio the Aikeles built at their home.

Music is a big part of the Aikeles' lives, but they have other interests, too. Jaime was just elected freshman class president. Sam is an avid skier, serves on student council and plays football.

"Asked how he finds the time and energy to do all he does, Sam sounds like an ad for Nikes. "Just do it," he says, shrugging.

"It can get tiring," he adds. "But I'm not on the verge of giving up."

Broadway's longest running show at the end of the line

NEW YORK - "This time, it really is the end of the line. "A Chorus Line," Broadway's longest running show, plays its 6,137th - and final - performance Saturday night.

The evening, a benefit for the New York Shakespeare Festival, has a top ticket price of \$500, and the 1,483-seat Shubert Theater has been sold out for weeks. The last performance promises to be an event, especially with most of the original cast in the audience, and possibly on stage at the finale. And it will be a celebration and remembrance of Michael Bennett, the man behind the musical, who died of AIDS in 1987 at age 44.

"In a funny way, we all felt the show wasn't going to close," said Tom Porter, who probably has seen the Broadway production more than anybody. "But now, we're beginning to realize it certainly is going to happen, and I'll miss it. When the show closes, there won't be a Michael Bennett musical on Broadway."

Earlier, the musical's production stage manager, has been with "A Chorus Line" for more than 12 years, first with the Chicago company for eight months and then in New York. From a spot in the back of the house or by watching a television monitor in his backstage office, he keeps an eye on each performance.

loves, hopes and fears.

During an extended series of workshops at the New York Shakespeare Festival, Bennett conceived the show, hiring Nicholas Dante and James Kirkwood to fashion the book, from the tapes, Marvin Hamlisch to write the music and Ed Kleban the lyrics.

The show, which arrived at the Shubert on July 25, 1975, after performances at the Shakespeare Festival off-Broadway, was an immediate hit. More than 6.5 million people have paid \$150 million to see the musical on Broadway. The show, which also has been performed in more than 20 countries, has made \$38 million in net profit for the festival.

But grosses have been dwindling, and the show incurred heavy losses last January. Joseph Papp, head of the Shakespeare Festival, announced Feb. 21 that the show would end its 15-year run the following month. It set off a box-office stampede, with grosses doubling to nearly \$400,000 a week. The original closing date, March 31, was extended by four weeks.

The extension enabled the show to do a special benefit on April 8, Bennett's birthday, which raised more than \$50,000 for "Equity Fights AIDS."

"It was an emotional night," Porter recalled. "The dancers went back to their dressing rooms, changed their clothes and the audience was still on its feet, applauding."

In the weeks since Papp announced the closing, the news media have descended

13-part public TV series focuses on Idaho history

A century of Idaho history and more than 400 hours of videotape are distilled into "Proceeding on Through a Beautiful Country," a 13-part series that begins Monday on Idaho Public Television.

Actually, as viewers of the first show will find out, the series probes back far further than 100 years: Much of the first episode, "The Land," graphically demonstrates how geology - long ago - shaped the land we now know as Idaho - but also how the changes continue today.

The Magic Valley, figures prominently in the first episode. Host Drich Bowler gives examples of the region's natural wonders: the Hagerman Fossil Beds, Shoshone Falls, Craters of the Moon, lava beds near Shoshone and the Snake River Canyon, all legacies of the state's tumultuous past.

"The slipping, rising, sinking and bending of Idaho is mind-boggling," says Bowler. "Any geologist looking for a challenge will come first to Idaho. More than half the state has yet to be geographically mapped, the show points out.

But the episode also makes clear that Idaho's people have harnessed some of its resources. The College of Southern Idaho, which uses geothermal energy to heat and cool its classrooms, is noted as one example. Another is Mike Archibald of Buhl, who uses the hot water from below the ground to heat his greenhouse business.

The series takes its title from the journals of Capt. William Clark. On Sept. 20, 1805, Clark, Meriwether Lewis and their Corps of Discovery had just entered Idaho after a weary trek over Lolo Pass.

Idaho was indeed a welcome sight to the weary explorers, and Clark wrote that they

The musical spawned four books in the last year, including a biography of Bennett by Boston Globe theater critic Kevin Kelly and "On the Line," remembrances by members of the original cast.

According to Ken Mandelbaum, author of "A Chorus Line" and the musical's main legacy is the way it

was put together through the workshops.

"From then on, almost every musical that got to Broadway went through some form of workshop," Mandelbaum said. "When the workshop of 'A Chorus Line' started, there was no script really and no songs. They went into rehearsal to create the show."

Today, he added, most directors and producers of musicals don't use workshops as effectively as Bennett did. They use them mostly as additional additions or as extra rehearsals.

"'A Chorus Line' also represents Broadway in a way that probably no other show did," Mandelbaum added. "No other musical was so about Broadway. And as it traveled around the country, people really got that feeling."

were "proceeding on through a battle, fate country."

The shows took almost a year and a half to produce. The crews filled 1,200-20-minute videotapes, interviewed more than 125 Idahoans, visited each of the state's 44 counties, climbed 12,665-foot-high Mount Borah and descended one mile into a mine.

They drove more than 63,000 around the state, and that tally doesn't include miles traveled by airplane, mule strings, llama packs, all-terrain vehicles, cross-country skis, rafts and a half-dozen other modes of transportation.

Themes that will be explored in future episodes of "Proceeding on Through a Beautiful Country" include settlement, water, religion, the arts, commerce and softude.

The hour-long shows will air each Monday through July 23 at 8 p.m. on KATD and the state's other public television stations. After the series ends, the episodes will be re-written and re-edited into 20-minute segments for future use in Idaho schools.

'First Power' doesn't even have a spark

According to the theology of "The First Power," the first power granted by Satan to his disciples is the power of immortality. But, according to the theology of storytelling, the first power granted by a storyteller to his audience is the power to suspend disbelief. And that is a power "The First Power" does not come close to achieving; it's not a movie, it's a brown-out.

What remains is a kind of dog and pony show, '90s version, which is a cop and psycho show, all of it generic and familiar. In fact, I think they've made this exact movie about 10 times in the past few years, but you can't keep a good idea, like a good killer, in the ground. This is the one about the homicidal maniac who is apprehended by a heroic detective, executed (in about three weeks) and then comes back as a murderous, laughing apparition with shape-changing and body-switching powers, all of them abetted entirely by uninteresting film-editing tricks.

The young actors shunted through the chutes-and-ladders formula this time are Lou Diamond Phillips, he of the trapezoidal head, Jeff Kober, who has a very square head, and Tracy Griffith, who has some-

what fleshy jowls for a beautiful woman. They are like differently shaped cookies, easy to tell apart because of the radical physical dissimilarity. If you get lost in the meanderings, you can always return to the True North of head shape: Trapezoid—Good; Square—Bad; Fat—Maybe Good, but we're not sure yet. This high-concept movie shorthand is much easier, of course, than actually establishing character.

Phillips is the cop with the "pendant" for catching serial killers and wearing expensive clothes with his cowboy boots. Frankly, this young man is about a decade and a half shy of the kind of weary, convincing gravitas that could make this movie work; you keep wondering whether he is old enough to shave, when his voice will change and if he still watches "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles" on Saturday mornings.

Anyway, he apprehends the murderous Channing, a Satanic killer who likes to tattoo stars on his victims, while wearing what appears to be a Tom Berenger mask, and watches him perish in a gas chamber. Channing goes out amid the dense fumes with a smile on his face and an I-shall-re-

turn pledge on his lips, and within a few minutes of screen time, he re-materializes from the ether to continue his rampage.

A beautiful woman psychic (Griffith) named Tess checks into the plot with weird predictive powers that keep Phillips in the game and keep the story, suddenly, shuffling. She also provides an opportunity for the endless jocular, needling guy-gal banter that has become the grist of the American movie mill in the '80s. Whenever the plot runs out of steam, director Robert Resnikoff will kill off a minor cop figure or throw in a generic car chase.

At some level, we want to believe because we want to be engaged. But the movie simply never lets us. It is as if Resnikoff is so completely addicted to thrills and charges that he can't just say no and in the end yields utterly to the cocaine of hazy ambiguitous preposterousness.

Idiocy heaps atop idiocy, and Resnikoff can't even resist the cheap booster shot of the violent sequence that turns out to be "only a dream" — three times! When a 6,000-gallon explosive acid vat, perfect for the disposing of psychos, suddenly shows up at the center of the Los Angeles sewer system, it is the R-rated movie that disintegrates, not the killer.

Hallmark Hall of Fame's 'Caroline?' is an absorbing, unusual TV drama

It hasn't been a very strong season for "Hallmark Hall of Fame," that traditional haven for some of the finest TV dramas over the years. The recent Hallmark productions have lacked fire, with the slightly moist "The Shell Seekers" followed by the downright tedious "Face to Face," the latter saved only by some breathtaking African vistas.

The latest and 165th offering, "Caroline?," while not vintage Hallmark on the order of "Protnoise" or "Love Is Never Silent," is at least an absorbing and unusual drama. It airs Sunday, April 29, on CBS.

Based on the novel "Father's Arcane Daughter" by E. L. Konigsburg, "Caroline?" is an intriguing mix — part romantic mystery, part pedagogical inspirationalism. Stephanie Zimbalist ("Remington Steele") stars as Caroline, a woman who shows up at the door of a well-to-do family claiming to be a missing member of the household.

Since Caroline was presumed dead after a plane crash years before, her "return" arouses some suspicion, especially since she has appeared in time to reap a large family inheritance. Most distrustful is Caroline's stepmother Grace (Pamela Reed), a controlling type who shelters her two children.

Grace resents Caroline's growing interest in her daughter Heidi — a physically handicapped child with emotional problems, played by former cerebral palsy poster child

Jenny Jacobs. In turn, Caroline feels that Grace's overprotective attitude is helping to keep Heidi handicapped.

The novelty here is how two very different strains of drama are interwoven. The issue of whether Caroline is real or an impostor belongs to a tradition of romantic fiction, that harks back to Gothic novels and creamy-deluxe potboilers by Daphne DuMaurier and others.

And the issue of whether Heidi is capable of learning more than Grace allows her to fits into the illness-of-the-week genre, in which characters strive to rise above their infirmities. The result is a hybrid of a drama — pulpy and suspenseful one minute, heartwarming the next.

What unifies these two strains is the fine acting of a good cast. Zimbalist, whom James Stewart has called his favorite young actress, keeps us guessing as to her character's motives. (There's a curious aspect to the way Zimbalist looks and acts here: She's the spitting image of that other TV-movie Stefanie — Ms. Powers.)

George Grizzard is suitably confused as Caroline's preoccupied mogul of a father.

That terrific actress Pamela Reed (star of the recent series "Grand") does a juicy character turn as the selfish and defensive Grace. And two Hollywood veterans, Patricia Neal and Dorothy McGuire, lend able support.

Neal has a particularly juicy scene in which her character, finishing-school director Miss Trollope, meets the enigmatic Caroline to test the young woman's veracity, having known her as a student. Neal plays the scene as a shrewd sleuth.

"Caroline?" isn't a drama for the ages. But it is engrossing, sustaining the is-she-or-isn't-she question right up to the revelatory climax.

'Wings' came in for a perfect landing but 'Earth Day Special' belly-flopped

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The premiere of NBC's "Wings" landed in the top 10, ABC's Earth Day special belly-flopped and NBC's "Cheers" was the top-rated show on television in the latest round of the Nielsen ratings wars.

"Wings" sailed into seventh place with its half-hour debut on Thursday night, flying over ABC's much ballyhooed "Twin Peaks." The latter sank to 28th in ratings released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

The peacock still struts as the No. 1 network with an average rating of 12.5. ABC was a close second with 12, and CBS retained its last-place status with 9.6. Each ratings point represents 921,000 households.

The hype surrounding Sunday's designation as Earth Day failed to lure a global-sized audience. Although "Time Warner Presents the Earth Day Special" won its Sunday night time slot, it fared poorly in the overall ratings. The two-hour program commemorating Mother Earth with an abundance of celebrities landed in a three-way tie for 16th place, with an average rating of 14.6.

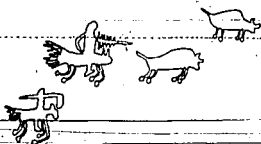

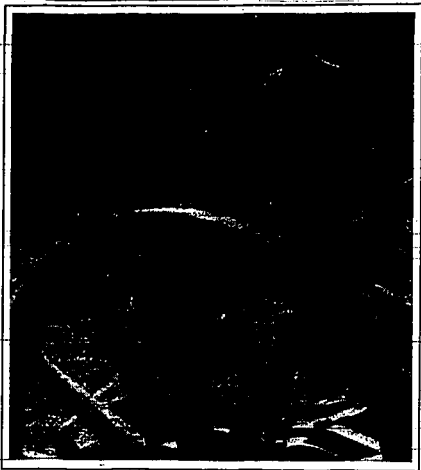
