## Bush drops nuclear arms upgrade plan for Europe

WASHINGTON — President Bush Thursday canceled plans for new battlefield nuclear weapons in Europe and called for a NATO summit this summer to "prepare for the magnificent opportunities" brought on by democracy in Eastern Europe.

The NATO allies, who were meeting with Secretary of State James A. Baker III in Brussels, promptly agreed to the NATO summit in London and to an East-West summit in Paris by the end of the year.

The Bush nuclear weapons announcement at a White House news conference sets the stage for early talks on the removal of existing Soviet and U.S. ground-based nuclear weapons in Europe, a development unimaginable even a year ago when Bush met with the allies in Brussels.

"As democracy comes to Eastern Europe and Soviet troops return home,

there is less need for nuclear systems of the shorter range," Bush said, summing up the political realities of 1990. "We need to develop a new strategy for the period ahead," he said, calling for the NATO meeting to plan for the post-Cold War era.

"The future of the United States cannot be separated from the future of Europe and, along with our allies, must prepare for the magnificent opportunities that lie ahead," Bush said in a statement he read before answering questions.

One immediate outcome of the reduced tensions in Europe and the rapid move toward German reunification, Bush said, will be scrapping plans for modernization of 700 aging Lance nuclear missiles, nearly all of them based in West Germany and aimed

toward East Germany.

Bush's announced plans to scrap modernization of the Lance and U.S. nuclear artillery shells in Europe received immediate endorsement from West German Foreign Minister Hans-Dietrich Genscher, whose country has adamantly opposed the modernizing plans.

Also enthusiastic were key members of Congress, where members had been vocally skeptical of the need to spend more for nuclear weapons in Europe where no existing or proposed ground-based nuclear weapons could reach beyond the now-democratizing Eastern European countries to hit the Soviet Union.

Senato Armed Services Committee chairman Sen. Sam Nunn, D-Ga., a leading congressional expert on defense, said the decision was overdue. "He's taken several steps, I believe, in the right direction — significant steps," Nunn said.

## Nuclear plant safety lapses turn up often Poorest cities found in Texas

WASHINGTON — Once-secret government reports on nuclear armaments plants reveal illegal drug use, major safety lapses, theft and other security breaches within the last nine months.

The troubles are catalogued in a six-inch stack of internal documents made public by the Energy Department this week, a month after a department contractor revealed their existence by mistakenly sending copies of one report to government offices.

The department initially tried to keep a lid on the revelations. Failing that, Energy Secretary James D. Watkins announced he was making the reports publicly available "to show that I am serious about changing the way DOE does business."

The release of the papers, called daily operations reports and written from the department's regional field offices, marks a significant, if limited, opening in the wall of secrecy behind which the nuclear weapons industry has operated for nearly a half-century.

The weapons plants are owned by the Energy Department and operated by private contractors.

The reports, covering the period of Aug. 24, 1989, to present, describe problems ranging in seri-

ousness from safety lapses at the Savannah River, S.C., nuclear reactors to worries about "media noise" over environmental problems at the Rocky Flats arms plant near Denver. Much of the information was presented in a shorthand form with little or no detail, but it unveiled several episodes not previously acknowledged to the public.

Among the more serious cases: A backup system for pumping water to cool one of the Savannah River nuclear reactors may have been unusable for the past five years because of a missing wiring.

Engineers discovered the problem only last December. Significant uranium releases at the Hanford weapons plant in Washington state were not reported for several months. The reason, the releases occurred after the Energy Department standard for radiation protection was inadvertently canceled in January 1989, but before it was reinstated in July 1989.

A faulty circuit breaker started two fires in a powerhouse at Savannah River last August, forcing two nuclear materials processing operations to be shut down for several days. No one was reported injured; damage was estimated at \$50,000.

WASHINGTON — Seven of the nation's 10 richest areas are on the East Coast, while four of the 10 poorest are in Texas, the Commerce Department said Thursday.

People living in the Bridgeport-Stamford-Norwalk-Danbury area of Connecticut remained at the top of the list with per capita personal income of \$29,084, according to a study of 319 metropolitan areas by the department's Bureau of Economic Analysis. That was up from \$26,316 in 1987.

The McAllen-Edinburg-Mission area of Texas was at the other end of the list with per capita income of just \$7,302, the study showed. People in that area ranked last in 1987 at \$7,001.

Boise ranked 120th on the list with a per capita income of \$15,911. For the nation as a whole, per capita income in 1988 was \$16,490, up from \$15,484 a year earlier. This gain of 6.4 percent outpaced inflation, which rose 4.8 percent as measured by the average value of the Consumer Price Index in 1988 and 1989.

Per capita personal income is the annual total personal income of residents from all sources, divided by the area population. It includes such items as dividends and rents as well as wages and salaries.

Nine of the 10 metropolitan areas with the highest per capita personal income in 1988 also ranked in the 10 highest in 1983, the report said.

Newark, N.J., which ranked twelfth in 1983, rose to ninth in 1988 with per capita personal

## Thatcher's Conservatives suffer heavy losses

LONDON — Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher's Conservative Party lost heavily in local elections Thursday, and socialists posted their best performance since she won power 11 years ago.

But the Conservatives, in deep trouble over the economy and the imposition of an unpopular new local government tax,

averted the rout forecast in opinion polls, where Mrs. Thatcher trails by nearly 20 points.

"Not a marvellous result, but certainly not the disaster that was being predicted," said Environment Secretary Chris Fatten, the Cabinet official in charge of the new so-called poll tax. "It's the massacre that didn't happen."

The Labor Party was jubilant. It was the only party to make net gains and

easily outstripped its target of 200 new seats.

With results declared from 180 of the 201 councils, Labor had made 10 new gains to control '89 councils. The Conservatives lost eight and had control of 36.

The third-running centrist Social and Liberal Democratic Party controlled three councils and had lost three. No party had overall control in the rest.

## Inventions Gizmos, gadgets go on display as creators from around world gather at convention

MONROEVILLE, Pa. — If necessity is the mother of invention, is silliness the father?

One might think that, based on some of the gizmos and gadgets on display Thursday when a convention to market inventions opened.

Among the items: a portable fire escape that can be anchored inside a window in a burning high-rise, a trap designed to lure fleas off the carpet and a device to repel mosquitoes with sound waves.

Also displayed: a plastic gun that clears clogged drains with a blast of compressed air, a sand-laden trash can that won't tip over, and golf shoes with playing tips stitched across the toes.

Would you believe a zipper tie?

Promoters and inventors from around the world showed off their creations at the Monroeville Expo Mart in suburban Pittsburgh, seeking investors and marketers.

The start of the three-day exhibition marked the unveiling of the engine created by Yoshiro Nakamatsu, who became known as the "Edison of Japan" after inventing the computer floppy disk and the digital watch.

Nakamatsu said his pollution-free engine, called Encrex, runs on tap water alone and can create three times as much power as a standard gasoline engine.

"It will generate electricity for any purpose," he said. "Petroleum will exhaust in 100 years." He said he plans to modify the engine and build a special vehicle powered by it.

Nakamatsu displayed some of his other inventions, including packages of "brain food,"

which he said contains "good elements" to encourage clear thinking. The snack food, which tastes like seaweed, is sold in Japan.

Nakamatsu, 62, said listening to Beethoven's Fifth Symphony and swimming have helped him maintain the creativity that has enabled him to obtain more than 2,000 patents in the United States and Japan.

"My best place to create inventions is under the water," he said. "So I swim every day." For swimmers and landlubbers alike, David Cecil wore the item he was promoting — a zipper tie.

"I'll never have to tie your tie again," he said, as he drew the knot down to display a hidden zipper.

He pulled the short end of the tie and zipped: "A perfect double-Windsor knot," he said. "A hundred percent silk."

## Scientists grow brain cell colony in test tube

WASHINGTON — Brain tissue from a child has been nurtured into a colony of living cells that eventually may be used to replace the damaged brain cells of people who suffer from Alzheimer's, stroke or head injury.

Dr. Solomon Snyder of Johns Hopkins School of Medicine in Baltimore said his research team has, for the first time, developed a continuous culture of human brain cells that divide and grow in laboratory dishes.

Other researchers called the discovery one of "tremendous signifi-

cance" that may cause an explosion of new research and treatment in brain diseases.

However, years of laboratory studies on the cells will be needed before the brain cells can be used on human patients, Snyder said.

The study is published in Friday's edition of the journal Science.

Scientists have long been hampered in their study of the brain because human brain cells won't reproduce. Except for a few exceptions in isolated areas of the brain, humans at birth have all the brain cells they will ever have.

If a substantial number of those

**Bush praises Jamaican-prime minister**

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush on Thursday praised Jamaica Prime Minister Michael Manley for a "first-class job" in promoting economic progress and promised to seek ways to help the country despite U.S. spending constraints.

Bush told Manley his administration would look into ways to relieve Jamaica's massive international debt and would try to provide more flexibility in a program that provides development loans through private banks, U.S. officials said.

U.S. officials say they are pleased that Manley has abandoned the socialist path he had taken when he was prime minister in the 1970s for more free-market philosophy.

**Drug-resistant gonorrhea on the rise**

ATLANTA (AP) — Gonorrhea resistant to penicillin and tetracycline registered "important increases" last year, federal specialists in sexually transmitted diseases reported Thursday.

The national gonorrhea rate remained about the same between 1988 and 1989, three cases in every 1,000 Americans. But a survey of 21 states found that the prevalence of penicillin-resistant gonorrhea more than doubled, up 131 percent, and tetracycline-resistant gonorrhea was up 23 percent, the national Centers for Disease Control said.

Virtually all the gonorrhea strains in the CDC survey were susceptible to two other drugs, ceftriaxone or spectinomycin. Such drugs are typically more expensive, but work in more cases, the CDC said.

**3 whites found guilty of black's death**

TYLER, Texas (AP) — Three white-former lawmen were found guilty Thursday of murder in the death of a black jail inmate in 1987. The all-white jury deliberated for about four hours, before finding former Hemphill Police Chief Thomas Ladner and former Sabine County sheriff's deputies Billy Ray Horton and James M. Hyden guilty in the death of Loyal Garner Jr.

An estimated 200 people packed the courtroom for the verdict.

**Brush fire in Florida threatens wildlife**

MIAMI (AP) — A 4-mile-wide brush fire raged through bone-dry Everglades sawgrass Thursday, jumping a canal and threatening 150,000 acres of a wildlife preserve.

"We're in big trouble. It jumped a levee 50 feet wide," said state ranger Gene Dempsey. "There's nothing slowing it down — there's no water holes, no breaks."

The fire, driven westward by 15 mph winds and fueled by sawgrass parched by Florida's two-year drought, had spread to 24,000 acres, or more than 37 square miles, by early afternoon.

The wildfire was one of three burning around Miami. A 10,000-acre fire in Everglades National Park southwest of Miami remained active Thursday, although park spokeswoman Pat Tolle said a federal firefighting team from Asheville, N.C., seemed to be containing it successfully.

**Air, sea weapons outweigh those canceled**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States is developing air- and sea-launched nuclear weapons that would more than offset the loss of firepower resulting from President Bush's cancellation of two land-based nuclear systems in Europe, analysts said Thursday.

Earlier in the day, Bush officially scrapped plans to field a new, more powerful version of the Lance missile and a modernized 155 mm nuclear-tipped artillery shell.

The decision had been widely anticipated, even though Bush strenuously argued for those weapons last year. West Germany and other NATO allies opposed the weapons.

Bush made no mention of the other

nuclear weapons already in the pipeline for European deployment. Private arms experts say these other weapons, some of which already are in Europe, have more military worth than either of the canceled systems.

The tradeoff is like "trading two handguns for an assault rifle," said Daniel Plesch, director of the British American Security Information Council, a private arms group.

Already in the American nuclear arsenal in Europe are an estimated 1,400 free-fall bombs carried by the F-111 and other European-based aircraft; about 1,200 artillery shells; 200 anti-submarine depth bombs and 700 aging Lance missiles.

The most important new weapon

marked for European deployment is an air-to-surface nuclear missile that could be carried on the American F-16 fighters based in Europe and the new F-15E nuclear strike aircraft now in production.

The leading candidate for an air-to-surface missile is the Short-Range Attack-Missile-Factical, which the Air Force is reported to be developing. It would have a range of about 250 miles.

William Arkin, an arms expert with the environmental group Greenpeace U.S.A., said the Air Force wants to start deploying about 300 of the air-to-surface missile in Europe by 1995.

The advantage of an air-to-surface missile is that it would give the air forces of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization the capability, in the event of a nuclear war, to "stand off" from the battlefield and still hit Soviet territory.

The United States now has no air-to-surface nuclear missiles in Europe. Britain and France are reportedly

cooperating to develop their own missiles of this type.

The now-canceled Lance missile, which was to replace an existing arsenal of 700 aging Lance missiles, would not have been capable of reaching Soviet territory.

Bush did not say he would withdraw any of the existing Lances, and Plesch said it was possible that NATO could agree to refurbish them to extend their useful lives. The Pentagon has said the Lances are due to become obsolete by the mid-1990s.

The existing nuclear artillery shells also are not affected by Bush's announcement.

Among other weapons in the pipeline are more U.S. shorter-range nuclear missiles for deployment on attack submarines based in the North Atlantic and the Mediterranean. Arkin said about 350 of these, called the Tomahawk Land Attack Missile, already have been deployed. Bush's 1991 budget calls for buying 75 more.

**House bill proposes 10-fold increase in child labor fines**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The \$1,000 fine for violations of child labor laws is failing to deter employers, lawmakers said Thursday as they proposed increasing the federal fine to \$10,000.

Businesses that repeatedly hire children for dangerous jobs or work youngsters for too many hours would face fines of up to \$100,000 and year-long jail terms for executives, under the measure.

The legislation was introduced in Congress along with the release of a study that reports such violations jumped 150 percent in a recent six-year period.

Under the bill, the Labor Department would have to keep nationwide statistics on workplace fatalities, injuries and illnesses involving workers under age 18.

House members who introduced the measure said the size of the nation's child labor problem is unknown because of poor record-keeping and detection.

"We have grabbed onto the large tail of an unseen beast," said Rep. Charles Schumer, D-N.Y.

## Bush frets over revolt against Gorbachev

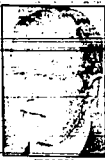
WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush said Thursday that he sometimes worries about the possibility of a military takeover in the Soviet Union that would unseat Mikhail Gorbachev and set back the East Bloc's stride toward freedom.

He saluted Gorbachev as "the architect of perestroika" and for exercising "great restraint" as Poland, East Germany and other Warsaw Pact countries shifted toward democracy.

However, he said at a news conference, "our foreign policy is not based on just Mr. Gorbachev."

Bush denied he was withholding support for Lithuanian independence because of a desire to see Gorbachev and his reforms succeed.

"I salute the man for what he has done. I think he's under extraordinary

pressure at home, particularly on the economy," Bush said. "I do, from time to time, worry about that will set back the whole process."

The president said reports that Gorbachev was under pressure from his military to backpedal from possible arms concessions on long-range nuclear missiles and submarine-launched cruise missiles were "a matter of some concern."

Bush announced he was canceling a planned modernization of short-

range Lance nuclear missiles aimed at the Warsaw Pact from Western Europe and setting plans to modernize U.S. nuclear artillery shells in Europe.

"I'm not doing these things ... just to put at ease the Soviet military," he said. "But I must tell you, I sometimes do worry about the military resurgence of some kind inside the Soviet Union."

One reporter asked about a report that Gorbachev was close to being overthrown Feb. 25 when large demonstrations were staged in Moscow.

"I was not advised of that by the intelligence community," Bush said. "On the Lithuanian secession crisis, Bush said, "we can't place this on a you-have-to-choose-between-

Gorbachev-of-Landsbergis," referring to the Baltic republic's president, Vytautas Landsbergis.

"I've expressed my keen interest in seeing perestroika succeed. Gorbachev is the architect of perestroika," Bush said. "Gorbachev conducted the affairs of the Soviet Union with great restraint as Poland and Czechoslovakia and (East Germany) and other countries achieved their independence."

"But you can't build a foreign policy of a country on the presence of an individual. You can build it on ideas."

On a lighter note, Bush said Gorbachev shouldn't be too concerned about the jeers he heard at Tuesday's May Day parade in Red Square.

## Barbara teach protesters lots, says Bush

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush said Thursday that protesting students may be right that his wife's recognition comes from his success, but declared "these young women can have a lot to learn from Barbara Bush."

"She herself said, 'Look, I know why I'm privileged to be able to serve in this visible fashion.' She's not trying to be something she's not. The American people love her because of her advocacy of literacy and stands for something," Bush said at a news conference.

Bush said he and the first lady do not object to the protest of Wellesley

College students who oppose her as a June 1 graduation speaker on the grounds that her recognition is due to her marriage.

"The president said Mrs. Bush herself acknowledges her ability to serve in a number of areas 'inasmuch as the fact that she's married to the president of the United States.'"

"But I think these young women can have a lot to learn from Barbara Bush and from her unselfishness and from her advocacy of literacy and being a good mother and a lot of other things," he said.

Asked whether there is merit in the Wellesley students' argument that

her accomplishments are related largely to being his wife, Bush drew groans from reporters when he quipped, "I can't have an argument with that."

But he said in a serious vein: "She isn't concerned that 125 students feel that way and I think they'll learn a lot from her."

A petition at the women's college said Mrs. Bush should not be honored at commencement because she "has gained recognition through the achievements of her husband, which contradicts what we have been taught over our years at Wellesley."

In an interview with a group of

newspapers Wednesday, Mrs. Bush said, "They're 21 years old, and they're looking at life from that perspective ... I don't disagree with what they're looking at."

Mrs. Bush dropped out of Smith College in 1944 to marry Bush. But for a part-time job as a newlywed, Mrs. Bush has never had a salaried job, devoting her life instead to raising their five children and to community volunteerism.

For many years she has been an outspoken proponent of literacy programs and as first lady has spoken out for such causes as the homeless and AIDS programs.

## Architect named for Korean War vets' memorial

WASHINGTON (AP) — An architectural firm was named on Thursday for the Korean War Veterans Memorial and plans to erect a sculpture by July 1 for the 38 heroic statues that are to dominate the site.

W. Kent Cooper, chairman of Cooper-Lesky Architects of Washington, said the memorial will be roughly the same size as the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, which is directly across the Reflecting Pool from the Korean memorial site.

William P. Lesky, president of Cooper-Lesky, said the sculpture is expected to take two to three years to complete. The number of the statues is still to be determined, said retired Army Gen. Richard B. Stilwell, chairman of the Korean War Veterans Memorial Advisory Board.

The statues will line a path ascending from an open area to the Lincoln Memorial to a point where an American flag will fly. The site has a view of the Washington Monument and in the distance, the Capitol.

The design, by a team of architects and landscape architects from State College, Pa., was selected earlier from among several hundred submitted in an open competition.

Stilwell, who commanded troops in Korea, said the Baltimore district of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers selected the team headed by Cooper-Lesky to provide architectural, engineering design and construction administration for the memorial.

Cooper-Lesky also led the design development team for the Vietnam Veterans Memorial.

Stilwell said ground might be broken as early as Nov. 11, Veterans Day, of 1991, and the organizers hope to have a dedication on July 27, 1993, the 40th anniversary of the end of armed hostilities in Korea.

He said about \$6 million of a goal of \$11 million has been raised.

**VA failing to collect money**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Veterans Affairs Department lost as much as \$392 million in one year by failing to collect from private insurance companies for health care, according to the General Accounting Office.

The report, released this week by the congressional auditing agency, says the VA missed collecting from \$55 million to \$392 million in so-called third party reimbursements in 1988.

The department spends about \$10 billion a year on health care for veterans, including those with private insurance. Congress in 1986 gave the government the right to collect from private insurers as a means of cutting the deficit.

The report did note, however, collections have greatly exceeded the costs of collecting the money. In the 1988 fiscal year, the report said, the VA spent \$8 million to collect about \$100 million from insurers.

The report said VA centers could increase collections significantly if they used better methods to identify insured veterans and bill insurers,

and committed more people and time to collections. "Even when centers identified insured veterans, they did not always bill insurers," the report said, citing inadequate controls and manual billing systems.

The report said many veterans are "confused or afraid that disclosures about insurance would jeopardize their admission to the centers."

The veterans department operates 172 hospitals, 233 outpatient clinics and 119 nursing homes. The hospitals recorded 1.1 million admissions and 20 million outpatient visits.

The report was based on collections at six VA medical centers: Albany, N.Y.; Bay Pines, Fla.; Martinsburg, W.Va.; Minneapolis, Seattle, and West Los Angeles, Calif.

The report was requested by Sen. Frank H. Murkowski, R-Ala., the ranking minority member on the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee.

The VA, in its response, acknowledged problems and said it was taking a number of steps to address them.

**Kids' group hits 'infomercials'**

WASHINGTON (AP) — A children's advocacy group asked federal regulators on Thursday to move against TV producers who violate stringent rules on advertising to kids' programs. Action for Children's Television, in a filing with the Federal Communications Commission, said it was prompted by a report that an upcoming show, "Video Power," planned to splice ads into the program so seamlessly that kids may not know where the program ends and the ads begin. "The Wall Street Journal reported on Monday that "Video Power," a half-hour syndicated show, would have as its host a 14-year-old named "Johnny Arcade." Johnny, the Journal said, "will rattle off 'news' items, such as countdowns of top hits in video games. Sandwiched in the minute-long countdowns will be 10-second or 20-second commercials, without so much as

a pause between the news and the commercial." A video-game maker, Acclaim-Entertainment, has purchased 20 percent of the show's advertising time, the Journal said. "Anthony Williams, an Acclaim executive, told the newspaper, "Children change channels during commercials. For one thing, their concentration span is shorter than that of adults. ... This, we think, is a good way for both producer and advertiser to sidestep that problem." Attempts to reach Acclaim Entertainment or the producers of "Video Power" were not immediately successful Thursday. ACT asked the FCC to investigate such program formats and warn producers that FCC rules require that ads clearly be separate from program content and that hosts of shows not peddle products.

# NATO tries to match changes in Europe

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — Spurred by the historic changes sweeping Europe, the United States and its 15 Western allies agreed Thursday to hold NATO and East-West summits this year to reach treaties reducing troops, tanks, artillery and other non-nuclear arms.

The decision was announced after Secretary of State James A. Baker III briefed NATO foreign ministers on a new U.S. nuclear missile cutback and on the need to adapt the alliance to a lessened Soviet military threat.

NATO Secretary-General Manfred Woerner reported the alliance's consensus to have a summit in London in early summer and an East-West summit in Paris by year's end.

"NATO is preparing for the future," he said. "The Atlantic alliance is taking advantage of the historic opportunity to move from confrontation to cooperation."

He said he would have a better grasp of the situation after meeting with Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard A. Shevardnadze in Bonn Friday and Saturday, and again in the Soviet Union in two weeks.

He also announced President Bush did in Washington, that the United States would shelve plans to deploy more powerful Lance short-range nuclear missiles in West Germany and would not upgrade nuclear artillery shells in Europe.

In addition, he offered to accelerate negotiations with the Soviets to make cuts in the current stockpile of 1,600 missiles with ranges of up to 300 miles once the CFE treaty is wrapped up.

The decision to shelve development of a new Lance missile underscores the rapid pace of change in East-West relations.

In May 1989, the NATO allies agreed to upgrade the aging Lance missiles. With those plans now canceled, the Lance will become obsolete by 1995.

In 1975, the CSCE set a course for lessening East-West tensions by promoting "human rights" and reducing military frictions.

Now, with NATO's military mission rapidly diminishing—the United States and its allies seek to expand the role of the 35-nation organization.

"We need a more ambitious agenda for the CSCE," Baker said.

He suggested such missions as monitoring "unusual military activities" and managing disputes between members.

To prepare for the 35-nation summit, Baker announced he would host a meeting of all-CSCE foreign ministers in New York in late September.

# E. Germany wants to privatize property

EAST BERLIN (AP) — East Germany, under pressure from the West, tried Thursday to find a way to shift its vast quantities of state-owned land and businesses into the private sector.

Under the ousted socialist system that ruled for four decades, the state-owned all property. West Germany has said a quick conversion to private property must follow the agreement the two nations reached Wednesday on merging their economies.

The agreement came under heavy fire Thursday from critics who said

it will speed the collapse of many East German factories and hurt poor and handicapped people by taking away social subsidies.

Thousands of shoe and leather workers at factories staged brief warning strikes to demand their jobs be protected. Employees halted work in East Berlin, Erfurt, Gera, Lauchhammer, Karl-Marx-Stadt and Weissenfels, the government news agency ADN said.

East Germany's finance and foreign ministers also criticized the plan, causing the first major cracks in the broad coalition government of

East German Prime Minister Lothar de Maiziere.

De Maiziere answered critics by promising to block the "uncontrolled" acquisition of state-owned assets by West Germans and foreigners.

West German Economics Minister Helmut Haussmann said a quick privatization of property and industry was crucial to creating a market economy that would spawn jobs and incomes necessary to offset the loss of huge social subsidies.

He said many details have to be worked out, but quick privatization

is needed to cope with the widespread joblessness in East Germany as the country is forced to compete in the free market.

"From July onward every company that's active in West Germany can also become active in East Germany," Haussmann said in Bonn.

Otto Graf Lambsdorff, head of West Germany's Free Democrats said a conversion to private property must quickly follow the decision to convert East German marks to West German marks.

# Mubarak: Egypt would help Syria, Iraq end feud

DAMASCUS, Syria (AP) — Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak said Thursday he wants to help end the feud between Syria and Iraq and persuade Syria's president to attend an Arab summit in the Iraqi capital.

Mubarak also said President Hafez Assad of Syria was willing to meet with his main foe, PLO leader Yasser Arafat.

Mubarak spoke to foreign reporters before his final departure with Assad. It was the first trip to Syria by an Egyptian head of state in 12 years.

In Baghdad, Foreign Minister Tariq Aziz said Iraq's president will invite Assad to attend the Arab summit.

But Assad said in an interview with Egyptian journalists he was surprised that holding the summit in Baghdad appeared to be a foregone conclusion without more discussion among Arab leaders. Assad said the meeting should be held in a location that is not disputed, Egypt's Middle East News Agency reported.

The feud between Syria and Iraq, one of the most bitter in the Arab

world, has been partly responsible for delays in convening a summit to discuss Soviet Jewish emigration to Israel.

"We had a lot of discussion yesterday but still there are so many points which need efforts, not only from Egypt, but from all the friends in the whole region so as to narrow the gap between Syria and Iraq," Mubarak said.

The Egyptian news agency quoted Assad as saying, "President Mubarak assured us more than once about his concern about good relations between Syria and Iraq. But he and many other Arab brothers appreciate that the gap is still wide between the two countries and may need more time and effort. Maybe time will help things improve."

Arab diplomatic sources, speaking on condition of anonymity, said Mubarak brought a "paper" to Damascus suggesting a meeting of the Syrian and Iraqi foreign ministers in Cairo.

Tariq Aziz, the Iraqi foreign minister, said in Baghdad that Saddam would dispatch personal envoys with invitations to all the Arab leaders next week, even though no date has been fixed for the summit.

# Patriarch of Russia, 79, dies in Moscow

MOSCOW (AP) — Patriarch Pimen, who as head of the Russian Orthodox Church presided over the faith's reawakening after decades of repression under Soviet rule, died Thursday at the age of 79.

Pimen died at his Moscow residence after a long illness, the official Soviet news agency Tass said. It did not elaborate.

Ax patriarch of Moscow and All Russia since 1971, Pimen led tens of millions of believers in the officially atheist Soviet Union.

Some critics accused him of collaboration because he operated within strict limits imposed by the Kremlin.

# Hungary backs tiny Lithuania

BUDAPEST, Hungary (AP) — Hungary's newly elected parliament Thursday declared its support for Lithuania, and the leader of a center-right party began trying to form the first non-Communist government in four decades.

At a historic session of parliament, Interim President Arpad Gombocz nominated Jozsef Antall, who leads the largest faction in parliament, as premier-designate and asked him to form a government.

Antall said he hoped to forge a coalition before the end of the month.

The new government will be saddled with a \$21 billion foreign debt — the largest per capita debt in Eastern Europe — double-digit inflation, rising unemployment and resultant growing social tensions.

"I appeal for confidence so that we can form Hungary's first coalition government," Antall said.

"Teachers in Buhl are upset at the insensitive way the board fired Tom Chivers," she said. "If we don't make a stand, they can get rid of anyone without following district policy. Tom Chivers has a right to know why he is being fired and to face his accusers," Brown said.

School Superintendent Eugene Pyles said the board members have not yet decided on a meeting date. He had no comment on the petition.

The board voted last week to terminate Chivers' coaching position, saying attendance was low at games because of the team's style of play.

Pyles said the board will begin interviews for the varsity basketball position on Monday. He reported that there are two applicants.

### Court OKs class-action suit in Blaine County

**HAILLEY** — A lawsuit against Blaine County will continue after the county lost its plea for the court to rule against filing a class-action suit.

The Roberts vs. Blaine County suit was filed requesting the court to declare illegal a one-time fire protection fee imposed on county building permits issued from 1985-89. The suit also requests reimbursement of the \$2,000 fire protection fees to property owners.

Judge George Granata Jr. ruled in 5th District Court the criteria and prerequisites were met to file the case as a class-action suit. Notices will be mailed by the court to prospective class members on 155 affected lots. Property owners can either "opt in or opt out" of the suit, Blaine County Prosecuting Attorney Ned Williamson said.

### Recycling banner donated to library by area students

**TWIN FALLS** — "Recycle — Use Your Library" reads a banner being donated to the Twin Falls City Library.

The banner was painted by Jerome students for Earth-Day celebrations and Library Director Arlin Call said it will go into the archives or maybe be displayed somewhere in the library.

"We welcome the notion that the banner speaks to us," Call said. "It is a shared responsibility. We have the less need here to consume resources." But Call said it's important too for individuals to have their own strong collection of books.

### Accident cuts power supply in Jerome early Thursday

**JEROME** — Some Jerome residents lost power for up to three hours Thursday morning after a truck knocked down a power pole, Jerome Police Chief George Silver said.

Roads were blocked around the accident for three hours while Idaho Power workers replaced the pole and fallen wires, Silver said.

The accident occurred at 8 a.m. at the intersection of Cleveland Street and East Avenue "H," Silver said. A trailer on a truck driven by Jay Scott, 41, Pendleton, Ore., knocked down the pole as Scott turned right onto East Avenue "H."

No one was injured, but damage to the power-pole was \$2,500, Silver said. Scott was cited for failure to carry proof of insurance, operating unsafe equipment and making an improper turn, Silver said.

### Rupert homeowners given interest on home damages

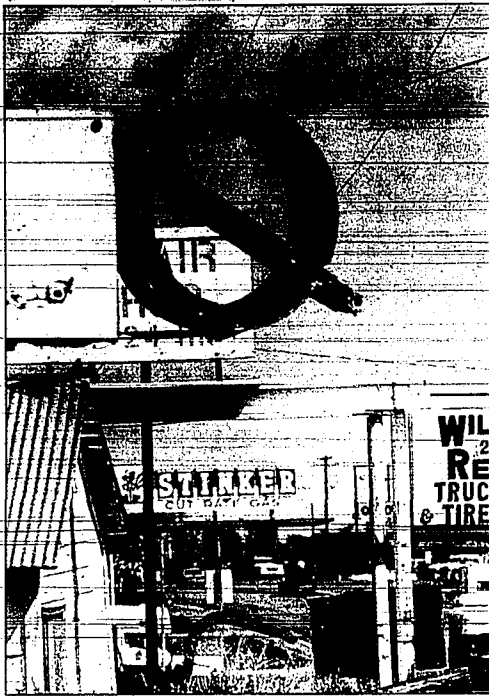

## Bliss residents cite need for town cleanup

**BLISS** — Talk at recent City Council meetings of a messy main street continued this week but broadened into accusations that other property, including that of the mayor — the most vocal proponent of clean-up efforts — needs to be spruced up too.

"The whole town needs to be cleaned-up," resident Gerald Weeks said during Wednesday's council meeting. "Frankly, the whole town looks like a junk heap."

But the city can't do much about cleaning up the town — other than urge volunteer efforts — without raising taxes, Mayor Roland Zollinger told four people at Wednesday's meeting.

Further, the city couldn't legally help clean up private property, he said. "Cities are getting sued left and right for these kinds of things," Zollinger said. "It's a very ticklish situation."

Zollinger said several local residents have talked with him about trash in the streets and the abandoned look of some of the buildings in town.

Much of the problem, he said, is trash blown from local businesses and yards blown from empty lots.

"In my opinion the biggest polluters are the Stinker Station and the

Roadrunner" cafe and gas station, Zollinger said. Also, a clean-up effort began on main street last month, but trash is still "everywhere," and the streets will have to be cleaned again before the Centennial, he said.

Three local residents, including Weeks, challenged the focus on main street. Weeks said the main road through town is nothing to be proud of, but that he is concerned mostly about the rest of the town.

He was not specific about particular businesses or homes but said in an interview earlier that day Zollinger's home and place of business, two streets from the main avenue through town, were the worst examples of the general mess in the city.

"He's got piles of junk everywhere," Weeks said. "Over at Lenkers (where Zollinger runs a box building business), he's got wood laying all over the place and junk everywhere."

"It's crazy that he's complaining about main street when his own place is such a mess. It's a firetrap," Zollinger declined to comment on Week's accusations.

Zollinger did say during the meeting Bliss has problems, but that they pale in comparison with a big city, where drugs and gangs are prevalent. He

## Attorney general to probe bomb range expansion

**BOISE** — Idaho Attorney General Jim Jones has agreed to a request by state Sen. Laird Noh to investigate the legality of the Air Force's public-review process for a proposed expansion of the Saylor Creek Bombing Range.

Jones said a member of his staff is making the probe at the request of Noh, a Kimberly-Republicain.

Jones said his staff will be looking at whether the Air Force's decision to prepare two separate environmental impact statements on the proposed expansion is legal under federal law.

Assistant Attorney General Clive Strong said he expects to reach a conclusion by early next week.

Noh, chairman of the Senate Resources

and Environment Committee, said the state should pursue "appropriate legal action" if the Air Force process has legal flaws.

Noh's concerns echo questions raised by attorneys with the Natural Resources Defense Council.

NRDC attorneys said the Air Force's approach puts the cart before the horse: In the Tier I statement, it would examine whether the range is needed, and in the Tier 2 statement, it would examine the range's effects in detail.

"Under this approach, the actual impacts of the range expansion will be revealed by the Air Force only after the decision to proceed with range expansion has been made," NRDC attorney Dan Reicher testified in Boise last month.

"The Air Force approach violates NEPA, impedes logical analysis and will diminish meaningful public participation," Reicher

said.

"My experience over the years dealing with environmental impact statements and the National Environmental Policy Act causes me to believe that the NRDC arguments are valid," Noh said.

Air Force officials reiterated this week that their approach is legally sound.

In a related development, Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, has asked the Air Force to answer other questions posed by citizens and NRDC experts during public hearings in April.

"It seems that the Air Force may be intentionally misleading the state of Idaho and especially the citizens of Blaine and Owyhee counties," Stallings wrote in the April 26 letter.

Stallings noted that citizens have voiced "strong" objections to Air Force proposals to fly super-sonic missions and drop live

bombs, two training requirements for F-4 aircraft.

The NRDC experts indicated the Pentagon plans to phase out F-4s before the Saylor Creek range could be expanded.

In particular, Stallings asked Donald B. Rice, secretary of the Air Force, to clarify the future of F-4 aircraft and whether 94 F-4s will, in fact, be transferred to Mountain Home AFB as planned.

Mountain Home AFB officials have said the F-4 aircraft will be transferred to Idaho from George AFB in the California desert regardless of whether the range expansion is approved by Congress.

Mountain Home AFB officials, however, have declined comment on the future of F-4 aircraft, saying those decisions are made at a higher level.

## School district mulls upgrade of computers

## Newcomb says shelter risks hidden

**TWIN FALLS** — Local surgeon Russell W. Newcomb said two local attorneys never told him the tax shelter he signed on to was risky — and he would not have risked \$200,000 of retirement money if he knew it was.

"I would not have entered the plan if there was risk involved," said Newcomb, a former state representative. He has sued attorneys Thomas G. Walker Jr. and M. Gary Atkinson over a local tax shelter that left dozens of professionals and local businessmen in trouble with the Internal Revenue Service.

"My understanding, from the beginning and throughout," Newcomb said, "was that this was a legal plan under IRS code ... it was a legal plan and there was no risk involved."

Newcomb alone had to cough up \$207,000 in a settlement with the IRS over his stint with Professional Leasing

Executive Leasing — a thing he put into his retirement trust from about 1983 to 1985.

Newcomb served in the Idaho House in 1987 and 1988, and is running this year for the state Senate.

During much of his testimony, the 55-year-old surgeon opened thick notebooks to retrieve documents used in the complex tax case. He often couldn't remember receiving letters Walker sent to him.

Newcomb said he got the impression from Walker that he wouldn't have to read the documents — which were full of "legalese" he didn't understand.

But Boise attorney Scott Wigle, representing Walker, then walked to a set of books containing the Idaho Code on 5th District Judge William Hart's desk.

"There's probably a lot of legalese in there," Wigle asked.

"Some, yes," Newcomb answered.

But Newcomb, who was the author of an AIDS package during his freshman term in the Idaho House, said lawyers working for the Legislature actually wrote bills.

Walker and Atkinson say Newcomb and the dozens of other professionals who sued over Professional Leasing never guaranteed the plan would stand a legal challenge.

Newcomb's attorney, Bob Koontz, argued that Walker essentially claimed that with a document sent to prospective clients explaining the plan. In it, Walker wrote: "Is the plan legal? In a word, yes."

Under cross examination, though, Newcomb said he understood that was Walker's opinion.

"He never guaranteed it would

## Glenns Ferry, potato factory seek answer to odor problem

**GLENN'S FERRY** — The city is working with a local potato processing plant to find a solution to its odor problems but a city-imposed deadline for dealing with the problem is too restrictive, a city official said.

Bob Hall, a local rancher and organizer of an effort to reduce the odor problem at the Magic West potato processing plant, read a letter at Wednesday's City Council meeting attended by many people wearing Magic West jackets, asking the council to

require the plant to have the odor eliminated by May 31.

Mayor Doyle Messerly said the city has been working for some time with Magic West on the problem, but made no promises about when the odor might be eliminated. "This is a complicated matter, and even if we could figure a solution out where available grants would help, the grant application period is 90 days; 30 days is an unreasonable amount of time," Messerly said.

Magic West Vice President Bill Schow, meanwhile, agreed with local businessman Jonn Morris' suggestion that plant officials

and other local residents meet privately to avoid the "outspoken emotion" associated with public meetings.

The odor results from bacteria in potato washwater that lies in a pipe for a time before it is sprayed onto a hayfield west of the city.

The odor has been the subject of complaints by many Glenns Ferry residents for years, saying it reduces property values and quality of life. Many say they fear starch, used in the washing process, will eventually pollute the Snake River, which is adjacent to the hayfield.

A little over half of the 70 or so people at

a public meeting Tuesday to discuss the odor raised their hands to set a 30-day deadline for eliminating the problem.

Plant Manager Jack Anderson says the water contains only the residue from boiled potatoes and is monitored by the state.

Councilwoman Jesse Fleming drew loud applause from both sides during Wednesday's council meeting when she said her primary concern is the workers and their families who depend on the plant for their livelihood.

In a related matter, Magic West officials Schow and Joe Kenworthy read prepared

### Court: State can keep hangman's ID secret

OLYMPIA, Wash. (AP) — The identity of Washington's hangman can be kept secret, a judge ruled Thursday.

Thurston County Superior Court Judge Daniel Berschauer found that disclosure of the man's identity probably would block execution of convicted triple murderer Charles Rodman Campbell.

Prison officials believe the executioner to be the nation's only qualified hangman, and he has made it clear he will perform the job only if his identity and hometown are kept secret, the judge said.

"The undisputed evidence is that the state could not proceed with an execution if disclosure were made," he said.

The American Civil Liberties Union said it would quickly appeal.

The ACLU had filed a request with state prison authorities seeking the name and qualifications of the hangman. The state responded by suing the ACLU and requesting an injunction against releasing the name.

Campbell, whose case is on appeal, was sentenced to die for the 1982 stabbing deaths of Barbara Hendrickson, Renae Wicklund and Wicklund's 8-year-old daughter Shannah. The two women testified against Campbell in 1976, when he was convicted of sexually assaulting Wicklund; the killings took place after he was freed from prison.

Assistant Attorney General Aaron Owada welcomed the decision.

Both Owada and the judge stressed that they support public disclosure as a general principle. But they said state law allows a narrow exemption in cases where disclosure would not be in the public interest and would hamper a "vital governmental function."

The judge said he was balancing the public's right to know with the right to have government run properly.

"We are a society of law, and if the Executive Branch is prohibited from enforcing lawful court orders (such as an execution order), then indeed there can be damage to the vital public interest," Berschauer said in ruling from the bench.

ACLU attorney Stephen Strong told the court the information is in the public interest and that the prison system has issued only hearsay evidence that the executioner might blow out if his identity was released. The state's \$1,500 contract with the man says only that the state would try its best to keep his name secret, he said.

### Plane may not land in Mountain Home park

MOUNTAIN HOME (A) — The donation of a surplus F-111 fighter jet from the U.S. Air Force for public display at a Mountain Home park has drawn protest and is now headed for court.

A hearing has been set in Elmore County Magistrate Court in Mountain Home on May 16 on placement of the aircraft at Carl Miller Park.

Opponents say the City Council rushed the project through without following proper procedures, and some say the plane is headed for the wrong park.

"We poured 79 (cubic) yards of concrete, and we're in this thing \$10,000," said Dean Wilson of the Air Force Appreciation Day Committee, sponsor of the project.

The group raised the money through donations from various veterans and civic organizations in town. No city money has been involved in the exhibit.

But a complaint filed by Mountain Home dentist Randall Morris last Friday contends the City Council erred when it approved the project two weeks ago.

The complaint says council members approved the Air Force Appreciation Day Committee's request to place the jet plane in Carl Miller Park without first referring the matter to the city Parks and Recreation Board and Planning and Zoning Commission for recommendations.

In addition, the council should have toured the site before voting, according to the complaint.

The parks board since has recommended against the project, saying the plane should go in a different city park.

Mayor Donald Litter said the vote to place the plane in the park was legal and that all legal procedures were followed.

"With the exception of the Parks and Recreation (Board), it was just overlooked; it was not intent. These boards are just advisory, you understand. The council makes the final decision."

Morris has obtained an injunction from a Boise magistrate to prevent construction. But the concrete for the pedestal already was poured, said James Burnham, Morris' lawyer.

Wilson said the Appreciation Day group has sought a plane to exhibit for 10 years and that Carl Miller Park was chosen because the annual September event's activities are centered there. The money raised already has installed the base and the pedestal, yet to come is landscaping, possibly lighting, and the airplane from nearby Mountain Home Air Force Base.

But some said that despite the fund-raising efforts among area organizations such as the Lions Club and American Legion, the plans weren't widely known until the mid-April council meeting.

### Report: Idaho students' scores above average

BOISE (AP) — A U.S. Department of Education report says that Idaho students are outperforming their counterparts nationwide, with above-average scores on college-entrance tests despite comparatively underfunded schools.

The annual state-by-state performance chart, compiled by the U.S. Department of Education, shows Idaho students last year scored an average of 19.1 on American College Testing Program examinations, compared with a nationwide average of 18.6. A perfect score is 36.

During the same period, the state spent an average of just \$2,667 per student, compared with \$4,243

Secondary School Principals, said America's young people "are simply too complex to hang on a wall."

The chart, he said, "has as much to offer educational improvement as the Edsel offered the automotive industry."

Nick Hallett, superintendent of the Meridian School District, said comparing ACT scores was dangerous because varying percentages of students take the test in each state.

Such comparisons would work only if every state agreed to test the top 25 percent to 30 percent of students. "Until then, you're just comparing apples-and-dough-nuts," Hallett said.

In the Boise School District, Jack Craven, director of curriculum, said, "Standardized tests are in and of themselves poor devices for making these comparisons."

The public may believe educators with that view are just being defensive, Craven said.

ACT tests are good tools for predicting an individual's chance of college success, but not an entire state's — or a nation's, Craven said.

Sally Keister, state testing coordinator, said that because Idaho is a small state with a relatively homogeneous, middle-America population, it could be expected to score higher than the national average.

### Utah plans sale of land rich in artifacts, relics

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — State officials are going ahead with a planned sale of southeastern Utah land that contains some of the most archaeologically rich sites in the United States.

The new owner will be under no obligation to preserve artifacts or ruins discovered on the land.

The Division of State Lands and Forestry has received an application to purchase two 640-acre parcels near the head of Mule Canyon on the Cedar Mesa and another 210 acres near Blanding.

The identity of the bidder was not released. Competing applications will be accepted through May 18.

"Whenever anyone submits an application to purchase, we consider system land issued only hearsay," said division director Pat Spurgin. "There is a public process we are going through that allows all viewpoints to be heard."

But Spurgin said the presence of archaeological ruins on the land is not an overriding factor in deciding whether to sell it, and the division imposes no requirements for mitigation of the cultural resources once the land is sold.

Spurgin said state school trust land is supposed to be managed for the support of public schools, not necessarily the overall public good.

The trust also mandates that the state maximize economic return.

All three sites under consideration for sale contain Anasazi ruins.

Opponents of the land sale are most concerned about two parcels on Cedar Mesa — an area many archaeologists have labeled among the richest concentrations of archaeological sites anywhere in the United States.

### Utah testing finds 30 prison inmates who have AIDS virus

POINT-OF-THE-MOUNTAIN, Utah (AP) — Thirty inmates at Utah State Prison have been found to have the AIDS virus during the first year of a Department of Corrections testing program.

Deputy Corrections Director David Franchina said that while the number of inmates testing positive for the virus is proportionately higher than other demographic categories, it is lower than authorities had expected.

Given the fact that many inmates have participated in high-risk behavior, such as homosexuality and intravenous drug use, the figure is "surprisingly low," Franchina noted.

State epidemiologist Craig Nichols said 30 positive results translates to just under 1 percent of the prison population.

By comparison, in New York, considered one of the world's AIDS epidemic's hot spots, more than 17 percent of the prison population tested positive for the virus antibodies.

There have been 282 cases of AIDS cases and 162 AIDS deaths in Utah since 1983, Nichols said.

Thirty-four new AIDS cases have been reported to the state so far this year.


Franchina said 3,539 inmates had been tested as of April 16.

# Idaho Briefly

## Centennial lottery tickets on sale

**LEWISTON (AP)** — Tickets to Idaho's newest instant-winner scratch-off game have gone on sale around the state, featuring an Idaho Centennial theme and a "second chance" to win \$100,000 on statehood day.

"If people have been waiting for a big game with a big prize, their wait is over," Lottery Director Wally Hedrick said Thursday as he unveiled the Centennial Celebration game at the Governor's Conference on Tourism in Lewiston.

The 19th since the state Lottery began operating last July 19 offers a top cash prize of \$1,000 with the odds of winning any money prize at one in 5.6. The other prizes are \$100, \$10, \$5, \$2, and \$1.

But it also offers entries into a drawing for a grand prize of \$100,000 and nine other large cash prizes. Over 14 million of the 12 million tickets in the new game carry a star in the play area. Entries for the big cash prize drawing require three tickets with stars, bearing the holder's name, address and signature, to be mailed in a special Centennial Celebration envelope to the lottery office.

## Union leader bashes Symms' probe

**IDAHO FALLS (AP)** — A union leader contends a federal investigation requested by Sen. Steve Symms of a five-year-old labor agreement at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory will open the door to unqualified workers and out-of-state laborers on construction jobs at the site.

"He's not just bashing unions; he's bashing the working Idahoan," Donn Larsen, business manager for Laborers International Union Local 155 in Idaho Falls, said Thursday.

Symms has asked the General Accounting Office to look at the INEL's "site stabilization agreement," which requires builders with contracts on the U.S. Department of Energy facility to hire workers through union halls.

INEL officials say the agreement is essential to maintaining a steady work force for defense-related construction projects.

## California company sees charges

**BOISE (AP)** — The Idaho Department of Finance has gone to court against a California company for violation of state securities laws, including fraud, in the marketing of a wine investment scheme to Idaho investors.

The suit, filed in 4th District Court in Boise, asks that Wine Futures Exchange of Westlake Village and marketing director Kenneth Gross and salesman Conrad Marshall and Mel Lowry be ordered to repay investors.

Department Director Belton Patty said his office was still trying to determine just how many Idahoans were involved in the scheme and how much money they lost.

Patty said the scheme involved the sale of investment contracts in California wines that were expected to appreciate in value and then be remarketed by Wine Futures Exchange later for a return of the original investment plus a profit. He said Idaho investors never even received their investments back.

## Gem court makes ruling retroactive

**BOISE (AP)** — The Idaho Supreme Court says a ruling on negligence by property owners will be applied retroactively.

In a divided opinion released Thursday, the Supreme Court reversed a jury decision against a lawsuit filed over an accident at a Council store, Shavers. A new 3rd District Court trial was ordered.

The court said it decided that a 1989 decision, giving property owners the responsibility of using reasonable care to warn and protect people against dangers on their property, will be applied retroactively.

Chief Justice Robert Bakes dissented from that portion of the decision.

Robert and Doris Baker sued Shavers after Mrs. Baker fell near an exposed ramp in the store and suffered injuries. After a trial, the jury ruled for Shavers under existing law.

## Idaho college gets building go-ahead

**BOISE (AP)** — The Permanent Building Fund Advisory Council has given the go-ahead to construction of a \$4 million library-computer science building at North Idaho College in Coeur d'Alene. After questioning the cost of the facility, which will run more than 20 percent higher than other college buildings the state has been constructing, the council on Thursday approved the final plans because the community college was raising \$800,000 of the project cost on its own.

## Middleton woman dies in car wreck

**CALDWELL (AP)** — A Middleton woman was killed when she lost control of her car and it rolled over on Interstate 84 near Caldwell, Idaho State Police said.

Marion G. Allen, 69, was eastbound on the freeway about 7:50 a.m. Thursday when her left front tire blew out and the car went out of control.

## Coeur d'Alene cracks down on noise

**COEUR D'ALENE (AP)** — The city's crackdown on loud car stereos and outdoor speakers takes effect next week, Police Chief Dave Scates says.

Police officers next Wednesday will begin issuing warning tickets to drivers of cars with stereos cranked up too loudly, Scates said.

The new daytime limit is 55 decibels, about the level made by light traffic 100 feet away. Previously, the permitted noise level was 92 decibels. Nighttime noise levels were reduced from 70 decibels to 45 decibels. Normal speech a foot away has a level of 65 decibels.

# Ricks says he has not endorsed Fairchild

**State Sen. Mark Ricks** of Rexburg said Thursday he has not endorsed former Senate majority leader Roger Fairchild or anyone else for the Republican gubernatorial nomination, despite claims to the contrary.

Ricks, who preceded Fairchild as majority leader, spoke on the Fruitland Republican's behalf during a recent candidate forum in Rigby.

But he said Thursday that he only spoke at Fairchild's request, and only as a courtesy.

"I could have done the same for (state Sen.) Rachel Gilbert," Ricks said. "The main point I was making was that it was important to elect a Republican."

Fairchild issued a news release last week saying he had received Ricks' endorsement, along with those of other senators. But Ricks said Fairchild had gotten the wrong impression.

"I'd better be calling him up and telling him," Ricks said.

Fairchild's wife, Mary, said the mistake was hers because she had misinterpreted Ricks' remarks when they appeared together in Rigby.

"It was my impression that he was giving an endorsement, but I understand that he can't take a position in the race," she said.

Ricks said Thursday that Ricks' clarification was "news to

The man Rush wants to succeed, 1st District Rep. Larry Craig, said during a stop Thursday in his campaign for the Republican U.S. Senate nomination that he thinks price supports for the silver industry are a bad idea.

A tariff on imported silver was suggested earlier in the week as a way to protect northern Idaho's mining industry.

It has been beset by low domestic prices, which some industry officials blame on subsidized foreign silver being dumped on the world market.

Rush raised the issue Wednesday, saying he endorses price support legislation introduced in the House this year by Rep. Richard Stollings,

D-Idaho. "My colleague from the 2nd District, author of the anti-competitive, anti-market proposal, should realize that instead of taxing the government to stabilize the silver market, we ought to be finding out what's making it unstable and correct those problems," Craig said in Coeur d'Alene.

In the Republican-primary-for lieutenant governor, incumbent C. L. "Butch" Otter said he was as surprised as anyone that former conservative state representative Robert Forrey of Nampa is challenging him.

Otter said business appointments made prior to Forrey's entry into the race kept him from hitting the campaign trail.

But with no Democratic opponent in the November election, Otter needs only to get past Forrey this month to be assured another four-year term.

In a campaign swing through Lewiston, Otter suggested he could do more for Forrey's agenda of encouraging private and home schools while Forrey can do virtually nothing for Otter's campaign to expand foreign markets for Idaho products.

"He's not looking to displace Butch Otter," the lieutenant governor said. "I think what Bob's looking for is an opportunity, a focus point from which he can make some clear statements."

'Father of television' honored with statue

WASHINGTON — Prolific American inventor Philo T. Farnsworth was accorded what many believe was long overdue glory Wednesday when a 7-foot bronze likeness of the Utah electronics genius was dedicated at the U.S. Capitol.

With his frail-looking but heavy-lidded 81-year-old widow, Elma "Pam" Farnsworth, looking on, the inventor was extolled as the father of television and placed in the pantheon of famous Americans that make up the Capitol's National Statuary Hall.

But like many of those other statues, Farnsworth's image actually will reside outside the crowded stately hall on the main floor of the Capitol.

"I think it's an honor to have my name on the word 'television,'" she told the audience of hundreds of Utahans gathered to dedicate the statue. "I was the first patent on his system; the precursor of today's television, in 1934 after winning a patent battle with the powerful RCA Corp. By the late 1930s, RCA finally had Farnsworth's million-dollar TV patents. But most history books list him only as one of many early pioneers of television."

S. African politics changing

But many things about this troubled country remain just the same.

CAPE TOWN, South Africa — After centuries of racial conflict, South Africa is facing whirlwind change as the government and its opponents negotiate to end white domination and try to find a new way to live together.

But even as the country witnesses scenes unthinkable a year or two ago, there are enormous divisions and problems to overcome. For all the rapid political change now under way, much remains the same.

The government Wednesday began its first formal talks with the recently legalized African National Congress since the black nationalist group was formed 78 years ago with the goal of ending white-minority domination.

For South Africans, the meeting created scenes symbolizing the historic change facing the country. President F.W. de Klerk and his Cabinet

smiled and chatted with ANC leaders on the sprawling grounds of an old colonial mansion that represented centuries of white wealth and privilege.

Nelson Mandela, released less than three months ago after 27 years in jail, complimented de Klerk on what he was trying to do for South Africa.

Law and Order Minister Adrian Vlok and top security officials posed for pictures with Walter Sisulu and other ANC leaders who imprisoned for decades.

Both sides talked of ending injustice and oppression and spoke of their hopes for a new, democratic nation. Mandela, in a reference to 350 years of white domination, said the two sides were finally ending a "terrible tradition of ... master and servant."

The two sides stressed the need for rapid progress and warned that peace hopes depend on swiftly finding a solution.

Latvians wrestle with independence issue

RIGA, U.S.S.R. — Latvia's legislature on Thursday began debating whether to declare independence from the Soviet Union, exhorted by Lithuanian President Vytautas Landsbergis to "be strong and have courage."

Landsbergis said he came to the neighboring Baltic republic "to be with my brothers." He said Latvians, if they moved more slowly than Lithuania on the path to secession, would be "treading through a jungle."

"I see and feel that Latvia won't retreat from the principle of independence," Landsbergis said in separate remarks to Latvian Radio. Pro- and anti-independence protesters surrounded the Latvian deputies as they entered the parliament building.

About 30 Soviet Army officers who live in Latvia gathered with signs proclaiming, "The People and the Army are United," and "We Won't Go the Way of Lithuania."

A few steps away, pro-independence protesters carried banners saying, "The Soviet Army Must Go Home," and "Independence for Latvia." Protesters carried Soviet flags of the red-and-white Latvian flag. The Latvian Supreme Soviet, or legislature, debated procedural questions. A vote on independence was likely Friday. Lawmakers from the separatist People's Front

predicted they could muster the two-thirds majority need. The Soviet news agency Tass said the People's Front and its supporters controlled 131 of 201 seats in the Latvian Supreme Soviet.

A two-thirds majority would be 133 votes. Anatoly Gorbunov, who was re-elected president of Latvia at the session, backed independence in a nomination speech. "I believe that the renewal of a legally sovereign nation must be accomplished," he said, declaring it a "normal way of life for all of the residents of Latvia."

Gorbunov, a 48-year-old former Communist Party functionary who has shown himself skilled at negotiating with Moscow, won 153 votes out of 196 cast. He warned that the republic could not expect help from the West. "The world, on account of 5 million Baltic people, is not going to risk what has been done in the area of arms control and by Mikhail Gorbachev," he said.

In Washington, Lithuanian Prime Minister Kazimieras Praksniskis said he would meet with President Bush at his republic would be willing to suspend independence measures opposed by Moscow if it had Western guarantees of support for its sovereignty.

Lithuania is enduring a Kremlin economic embargo imposed in response to its independence declaration. The right is reserved to reject all proposals, or to accept the proposer's terms. 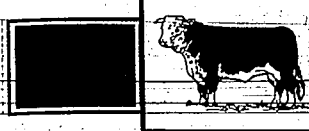

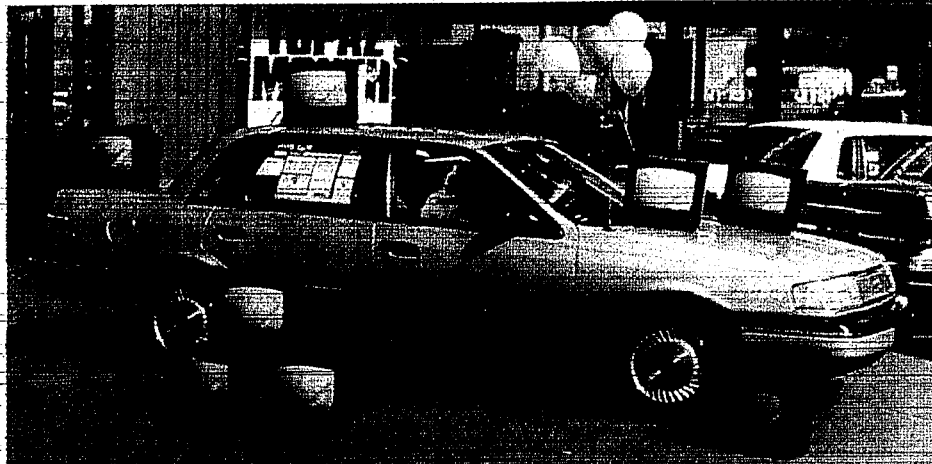

## Spring pops Symphony highlights classic Gershwin tunes in season's final concert

TWIN FALLS—Back in the 1920s, serious musicians and critics sneered at the vivacious, adventurous new music called jazz. It took George Gershwin to change their minds.

Jazz, according to The New Grove Dictionary of American Music, was thought by most experts of the day to be "slapdash in execution and conducive to poor musicianship."

But a New York City concert in 1924 aimed to show jazz could be combined with a symphonic arrangement for far more pleasing results. The concert featured the Paul Whiteman Band and Gershwin in a performance of the latter's new "Rhapsody in Blue," and it "immediately won the audience's approval and the critics' attention," according to the encyclopedia.

Gershwin's masterpiece is also likely to win the approval of the Magic Valley Symphony audience when the ensemble features it in tonight's final performance of the season, the Spring Pops Concert. The orchestra will accompany guest pianist Laurin Vizzutti in its rendering of "Rhapsody."

Rounding out this season's roster of

guest conductors will be Bruce Whitehead, who has previously appeared in many area musical productions.

He will be joined by guest artists Eileen Farrell and Roger Vincent, whose voices are also well known to Magic Valley concertgoers. They will perform a wide selection of favorite Gershwin tunes.

In addition to "Rhapsody in Blue," the musical menu tonight will feature a medley from the musical "Girl Crazy," including such songs as "I Got Rhythm," "But Not For Me" and "Embraceable You."

The concert will also include a medley from the musical "Porgy and Bess," another of Gershwin's best-known achievements. Songs from the smash Broadway show include "Summertime" and "It Ain't Necessarily So."

Gershwin, the son of Russian immigrants, grew up in New York City. Despite much formal musical training, he had a gift for melody and was composing by age 20.

At 30, he was America's most famous composer. But by 1937, he was dead at age 38 of a brain tumor. His early death was one of the century's greatest shocks to the musical community, but he will long be remembered as the man who brought jazz into the concert hall.

## Cheating reports make box office count suspect

HOLLYWOOD—Weekly box-office figures supplied by movie studios are sometimes as accurate as an old-fashioned Chicago slot count, say insiders, including some who admit to fudging the numbers to get ahead.

Making movies is more competitive than ever these days, and the charts that rank them as hot or flops represent free and, some say, persuasive advertising. So why

"It's gotten really out of hand," said an executive at one major studio who spoke on condition of anonymity. "I used to think that the independents were the only people who (cheated). But that's not true any more."

Here's how it works: Big studios like Paramount and Disney and independents such as Miramax and New Line base their weekend grosses on surveys of about 75 percent of North America's movie houses. The polling for the most part, is conducted by telephone by Entertainment Data Inc.

But drive-ins, Spanish-language theaters and some small theaters and movie houses in Hawaii are not surveyed—and that's the key.

Let's say "Ghostbusters 2: The Revenge of Casper" collected \$4.5 million at the screens surveyed by EDI. "Honey, I Enlarged the Kids" made \$4.3 million, EDI says.

Estimating ticket sales from the 25 percent of theaters not surveyed by EDI, "Ghostbusters" could report a correct final take of \$5 million. The makers of "Honey," not wanting to land in second place, could

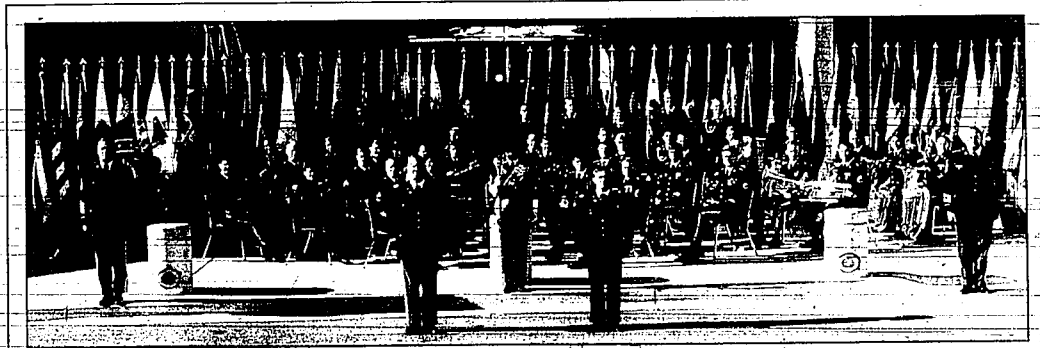
rewrite the figures for the 25 percent for their movie to show it received \$5.1 million.

And just like that, "Honey" ads appearing in newspapers the next day read: "The Nation's No. 1 Movie!"

"There is a lot of temptation to want to be in the top five," said Art Murphy, who analyzes box-office figures for the trade publication Variety.

He believes that tinkering has become commonplace but that any large-scale manipulation would be easily detected.

## Crack Army band to give musical salute

TWIN FALLS—One of the nation's best military bands marches into the Magic Valley Sunday to give a concert of melodies, movie themes and patriotic music.

The Army Ground Forces Band will present a 90-minute program starting at 3 p.m. in the College of Southern Idaho's Fine Arts Auditorium.

Commanded and conducted by Maj. Michael D. Pyatt, the band's first half selections will include "Tara's Theme" from

"Gone With the Wind," "How the West Was Won," and "In the Mood." Following intermission, the second half will feature such patriotic selections as "Armed Forces Salute" and "Stars and Stripes Forever."

Twin Falls is the fourth stop on the band's 13-concert tour of the Pacific Northwest. Its appearance is sponsored as a public service by The Times-News.

"We do three national tours every year. Our mission is to be the ambassadors of freedom, to show people the lighter side of the Army, that we're not just about

weapons and fighting," said Lt. Beth Steel, the band's Executive Officer and Associate Conductor.

The 55-member band entertains over a million people each year through the work of its eight component ensembles and quintets, including the Jazz Ensemble, the Dixieland Band and the Woodwind Quintet.

"We have two or three commitments a day for the various elements. Some will be scheduled for opening ceremonies someplace and then a bugler will be out doing a job, too," said Steele.

Stationed at Fort McPherson in Atlanta, Ga., the Army Ground Forces Band repre-

sents the Army's largest command. Its standards of excellence go back almost 150 years to the band's beginnings in Texas as the 4th Infantry Regiment.

The band has 26 campaign streamers commemorating its participation in the Mexican War, the Civil War, the War with Spain, the Philippine Insurrection and both World Wars.

In addition, the band holds the honor of being the only organization of its kind to receive a combat distinction from a U.S. president—Zachary Taylor. During the Battle of Monterrey, Mexico in 1846, the

# Success problems: Overexposure worries 'Simpsons' producers

On the surface, the astounding success of "The Simpsons" prime-time cartoon series would appear to be a dream come true for the image makers at Fox Television.  
One might think that Homer's family's Odyssey into the hearts and minds of the American viewing au-

dience would be heady grist for the publicity mill—at a fast-emerging television network, a time to milk the cash cow for all it's worth.  
But noooo, say they at Fox. At a time when the temptation might be to embark on a full-fledged Simpsonsmania campaign, a time when Newsweek features America's most neurotic cartoon family on its cover

and the show's producers receive upwards-of-50 requests for interviews a week, the powers that be at Fox are instead trying to pull back the reins.  
With only two unshown episodes left (from the original 13) and slated to be shown during the May ratings sweep, Fox executives fear that unchecked exposure during a long,

hot summer of reruns could result in Simpsons' overkill before the new shows arrive in the fall.  
To illustrate their seriousness, Fox has put the kibosh on proposed Simpsons features in a number of other high-profile magazines and TV shows, including Time and Entertainment Tonight.  
"We're just saturated," said An-

nie Coffman, a senior program publisher for Fox. "We don't want people to get sick of it. It's a wonderful problem, but it's still a problem."  
Another consideration is the demands on the time of co-producer and creator Matt Groening—who pens the popular "Life in Hell" cartoon strip in addition to his work on "The Simpsons"—and others involved in the show. Neither Rome nor a Simpsons episode can be created in a day; each production of the

latter takes about six months from original concept to finished product.  
With a goal of 22 new episodes for the fall season, everything else must take a back seat for the time being, says Brad Turell, Fox Broadcasting's senior vice president of publicity. "We're not being smug, it just is too much, we're overwhelmed," said Turell from his office in Hollywood. "What happens is that it takes on a life of its own and it can get out of control."

## Centennial photo exhibit goes to Ketchum

The exhibition will remain on view until May 25 before moving on to Driggs. After its tour, the exhibit will be given to the state of Idaho as a lasting legacy.  
The collection was organized for the Celebration of the Century by the Idaho Photographic Workshop of Boise and the Idaho Photographic Society based in Ketchum.

# Wascally wabbit Bugs Bunny will be half a century old in July

NEW-YORK (AP) — He may be 50, but that doesn't make Bugs Bunny an old gray hare.

The wascally wabbit and long-time forerunner of Elmer F. Fudd hits the half-century mark this year, and the carrot-chomping star with the Brooklynese tongue is aging as gracefully as ever.

"Everybody knows who I am, Doc. I don't cayb where dey are or who dey are. Even in Mars dey know about me. Heh heh heh," Bugs once said in an interview with The Associated Press.

Success didn't come easily for Bugs; he had to change his name and work underground before making it big. But he's enjoyed a career many Hollywood stars — living or sketched — would envy.

He surfaced this year as a presenter on the Academy Awards; in 1958, he won his own Oscar for best animated short feature, "Knighty Knight Bugs." The rabbit since has become a Saturday morning cartoon fixture, and makes more prime time appearances each year than Bob Hope.

On Dec. 21, 1985, Bugs received a star on Hollywood's Walk of Fame — admittedly, not in the best spot. He sits between cowboy actor Rory Calhoun and actress Lucerne Fulte, who made such memorable movies as "The Clonus Horror," "White Mama" and "Final Chapter — Walking Tall."

The brash bunny was the consummate cool. Always undersized, he outwitted grouchy, graminis, Daffy Duck and gun-toting galeos. In "Haredevil Hare" he defends the honor of Earth against a Martian with high-top sneakers named Commander X-2.

He's sung opera and tweaked the nose of pompous tenors. He out-raced tortoises and hounded hunting dogs.

And his rabbit hole was his castle, to be defended to the death against developers and intruders. "Of course, you realize, this means war," Bugs would say to those who provoked him.

You'd never see Bugs with a girlfriend, and like Milton Berle, he'd flirt in drug to confuse a foe. But Bugs was his own rabbit — fiercely independent and fresh.

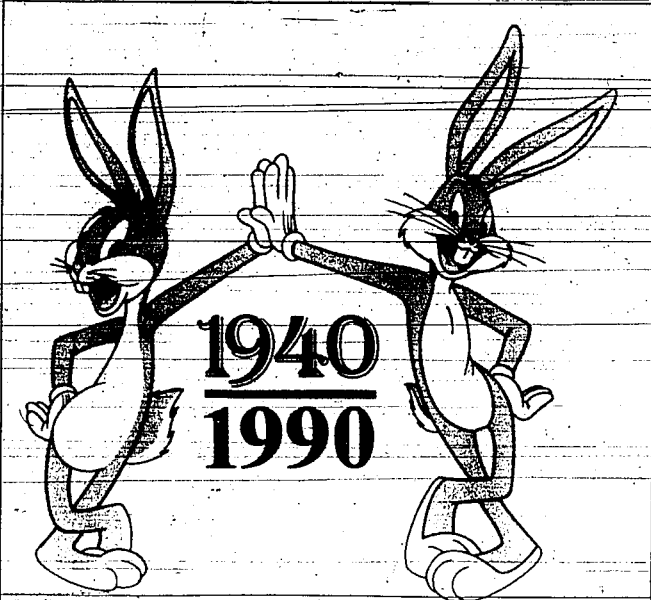
Bugs' encounters with frequent foil Fudd are regarded as classics. The easily frustrated Fudd was battered by Bugs from infancy to old age in a series of shorts.

After tormenting Fudd in one episode, Bugs turned to the audience and chuckled: "I do dis kind of stuff to him all through the picture."

Rarely did Fudd ever turn the tables on his oft-mated adversary. Once in a story in which Elmer portrays a millionaire who's gone off the deep end. He and his shrink keep repeating the same dialogue throughout the cartoon: "My name is Elmer F. Fudd, millionaire. I own a mansion and a yacht. The oft-repeated line finally gets to Bugs who checks into a mental hospital.

In another cartoon, a Wagner send-up, Fudd, clad in Viking horns, sings to the strains of "Ride of the Valkyries": "Kill the wabbit, kill the wabbit..."

The Bugs-Fudd battles — most featuring Elmer as a befuddled hunter — have recently been honored in a Museum of Modern Art exhibit and preserved at the Museum

of Cartoon Art. The latter is planning an anniversary retrospective for Bugs. The 50th birthday will also be marked with widespread release of Bugs video collections, a prime-time special and a special Bugs magazine produced by LIFE magazine.

It's been more than his lucky rabbit feet that have kept Bugs on top through the decades. He's outlived the Flintstones, seen a future without the Jetsons... and continues to ride

high in the age of the Simpsons. So what is it about Bugs that makes him timeless?

"Bugs is a natural person leading a normal life until someone aggravates him. I hear he fights back," explains Chuck Jones, now 77, who directed more than 50 Bugs shorts. "In other words, he's a sort of counter-revolutionary."

Bugs is 'hero to many of us. He does the things we'd like to do but

don't have the 'noive' to carry through.

His vintage cartoons are currently seen all over television by a third generation of kids. In addition to Saturdays, he appears daily on na-

tional cable stations Nickelodeon and TNT and is the top-rated show on both.

Jones admits Bugs can be a bully or a nuisance, so he took great care in setting the rabbit in situations in which he would remain a sympathetic figure.

Mel Blanc, the man of 1,000 voices who gave life to Bugs, would defend the rabbit's honor if he didn't like a script, telling the writer, "Bugs wouldn't do that," or "Bugs would never say that."

It was Blanc who changed "Happy Rabbit," a nice-guy bunny of the late 1930s, into the rough and tumble rabbit we've come to know and love. Blanc ditched the winpy name, added the "dese" and "dose" of streetwise Brooklyn and rechristened the character Bugs.

The west, as they say, is history.

Bugs debuted on July 27, 1940, in the short "A Wild Hare," and he was off and running.

Early on, he became part of the World War II propaganda pitch, turning up as a drafted, superpatriotic Marine — a "real Superman" — a "Rabbit-the Riveter" assembly-line worker. Today, he's joined the "Just Say No" war on drugs, appearing in an anti-drug cartoon that aired last month.

Through the years he's become even more underdog than he was in the beginning, increasingly opting for brains-over-brawn. Such adaptability has served him well. In dozens of shorts, Bugs has remained a Hollywood trendsetter.

Long before Sigourney Weaver battled "Aliens," Bugs went mano-a-mano with Commander X-2.

Forget "Field of Dreams" and other baseball flicks. "Baseball

Bugs" featured a slow-balling Bugs playing all nine positions and defeating the Gas House Gorillas. Bugs scales the Empire State Building for the game-saving catch.

Robert De Niro's untouchable Al Capone? The rabbit took on legendary tough guys Edward G. Robinson and Peter Lorre in "Racketeer Rabbit." And Bobby D.'s turn as Jake LaMotta in "Raging Bull" had little on Bugs' showdown with boxing brute The Crusher.

There's much, much more: Bugs as the straight hare in a Jekyll and Hyde send-up, Bugs evading two Robinson Crusoe types bent on turning him into roast rabbit, torturing him into roast rabbit, torturing two French chefs with similar intent, outwitting a rabbit-bashing witch on Halloween.

And there's more than a touch of bad boy in Bugs; in addition to his Fudd abuse, he frustrated Yosemite Sam to the point where Yosemite screams "great horny toads," driven Daffy Duck near deaf and dispatched dozens of animated assassins.

"Ain't I a stinker?" he says in one cartoon.

But it hasn't been all good news for the rabbit over the last 50 years. The death last year at age 81 of Blanc, who had been the voice of practically all the Warner Bros. Looney Tunes-Merrie Melodies characters, was a blow to fans around the world. But Blanc didn't take the rabbit's "What's up, Doc?" with him.

His son, Noel, and actor Jeff Bergman have taken over as the bunny's voicebox, and Bugs is still going strong.

To anyone who might think an aging Bugs has seen his best days, well, as Bugs might say: "He don't know me vewy well, do he?"

# 'The Guardian' mistakes primal silliness for primal terror

**HOLLYWOOD** — "The Guardian," a horror film featuring homicidal trees, will be a smash hit on the East coast. William Friedkin's shocker is supposed to be primal, terrifying, but primarily silly is more like it.

"And yet you can't just dismiss this film with a steady stream of wisecracks. The cracks are too vile, too humorlessly sadistic. The Guardian is inept, but even if it were better, the question remains: Do we really need a movie about a nanny who spirits babies into bloody oblivion?"

The opening credits thoughtfully alert us to a thousand-year-old Druid ritual in which humans are sacrificed to trees. Given the silliness of the acting in this movie, it would appear that the entire cast has been sacrificed.

Phil (Dwight Brown) and Kate (Carey Lowell) are dual-career yuppies who, to make ends meet in their spacious new Los Angeles canyon home, hire a live-in nanny, Camilla (Jenny Seagrove), for their baby boy. For a woman with a job rating of "A-1," True, she has a British accent — a sure sign that something effete is afoot — and a faraway look that spells come-hither to Phil. She takes baths and leaves the door strategically ajar.

But it's not until the couple's yup architect (Rand Hall) sneaks a peek at Camilla's woodland gambols that the jig is up. (His jig is up too, courtesy of some ravenous coyotes.) Phil is contacted by a distraught mother whose baby was kidnapped by a woman

fitting Camilla's ID. A check of Camilla's resume turns up phony credentials. Confronted with the truth, Camilla unveils her powers, which, like her ability to fly or moli, or whatever, seem to change from scene to scene. — *See also the film makers, like the parents, are in trouble.*

"The Guardian" is being touted as a supernatural horror-film variation of a parent's worst nightmare, but the baby in the movie is given surprisingly little attention. The film makers have no feeling for this child; his endangerment is the film's McGuffin, a pretext for gore. When the bereft mother of the kid-napped child tells her sad tale to Phil, we expect some kind of follow-up, some further registration of her pain. Or some relief, perhaps. But she's a McGuffin too.

Even the film's creepiest special effect — a twisted tree with the contorted faces of babies writhing through the bark — is exploited solely for its gore potential. Phil takes a chain saw to the tree and blood pours out.

Kate gets almost as short shrift from the film makers as her baby. What "The Guardian" really is about is the husband's erotic attraction to the nanny. The film, adapted from a short story by co-screenwriter Dan Greenburg, is really a male fantasy about the dreadful consequences of turning off to your wife in her motherly mode and looking astray. It's "Fatal Attraction" with birch bark.

"The Guardian" (rated R) is clearly William Friedkin's bid to re-enter the big time by mainlining "Exorcist" style horror. But the horror-film landscape has changed

since he made "The Exorcist." Nowadays it's the real-life horror movies such as, yes, "Fatal Attraction" that tend to scare audiences the most. The Stephen King movie

adaptations, and their imitators, are usually effective only insofar as they make fun of their own pulp horror conventions. There's surprisingly little (intentional) hu-

mor in "The Guardian," and that makes it seem even more objectionable. A movie this scary hasn't earned the right to its seriousness.

# 'Crazy People' takes good idea and gives it confused treatment

**CRAZY PEOPLE (R)**. A good sci-fi idea gets a sappy, confused treatment in this comedy about an orphan (Dudley-Moore) who is locked up in a sanitarium when he gets sets that actually tell the truth. A few sharp jabs at Wall Street, but the film makers don't seem to recognize that their "truth advertising" gig is as much of a con as the stand ad-pub factory. Daryl Hannah and Mercedes Ruehl co-star.

**THE HUNT FOR RED OCTOBER (PG)**. There's an amiable smartness to this underwater thriller. Its film makers know that a little technology goes a very long way, and if they hope to keep an audience's attention they'll have to do it with story, not hardware. Director John McTiernan, whose signature is

sleek action ("Die Hard"), his first-rate cast (including Sean Connery, Alec Baldwin, Scott Glenn and Sam Neill) and writers Larry Ferguson and Donald Stewart have managed this nicely. You may not be limp from accumulated tension when this hunt is over, but its cautiously upbeat global message leaves a crackling glow and the premise is a crack-jerk one.

**LISA (PG-13)**. There's something almost insulting about the glassy, glossy photographic perfection of this psycho-thriller. It's based on a sleazy idea: a cautionary tale that suggests single mothers shouldn't repress their daughters, or they'll wind up engaging in anonymous-phone flirtations with serial killers. Director Gary Sherman deliberately soft-pedals blood-and-guts until the end, but it's a transparent ploy: like someone trying to tell a dirty joke, tastefully.

**NUNS ON THE RUN (PG-13)**

AS Sister Euphemia and Sister Inviolata, two gangsters who flee the mob and take it on the lam to a nunnery, Eric Idle and Robbie Coltrane give director Jonathan Lynn's drag comedy — "Some Like It Hot" in Catholic School — a little bawdy color. But it's mostly half-funny, mechanical, crude, filled with jokes you have to take on faith. Like a kid who's gotten license to be naughty, it comes on; smirks; does it number and then tries to get off fast.

**PRETTY WOMAN (R)**. Updating "Pygmalion" and sprinkling it with Cinderella dust may seem like a perfectly workable idea until you get into the nuts and bolts of "Pretty Woman." Here, Richard Gere's bored cipher of a corporate raider transforms Julia Roberts' happy Hollywood Boulevard hooker into a lady he can pass off at a polo match in less than a week. This is a movie that barely has a moment to call its own and the ones it has are gummy, materialistic and possibly life-threatening. Some fairy tale for the '90s

# Meredith Baxter-Birney's new movie, 'Burning Bridges,' is no 'Family Ties'

By EYAN LEVINE

If you've seen Meredith Baxter-Birney lately, you know she isn't smiling a lot. But don't get us wrong: That's just because she's been appearing in a series of rather dramatic TV movies. Her most recent, "Burning Bridges," focuses on a married woman whose affair with a married man almost destroys her family and her sanity. It co-stars Nick Mancuso, Derek de Lint and Lois Chiles, and airs Sunday, May 6, on ABC. It's a long way from "Family Ties."

"I look for variety in my work," Baxter-Birney explains, calling from her car phone in Los Angeles as she looks for a place to park. "In this case, I liked the project because the writing is honest, not melodramatic. The writing comes out of a situation. It's a natural process. It's about people who don't know what to do with what's been put on their plate. Anything I say about this movie will sound like it would apply to a typical story about a woman who's married who has an affair, but it's got like that."

Even Baxter-Birney was surprised by the emotional difficulty of the scenes in "Burning Bridges" — both acting them and watching them. "I've seen a rough assemblage of it," she explains, "and I think I'm going to tell my mother it starts 15 minutes later than it does."

She's referring to the opening love scene in the movie. "I was astonished by how intimate it seems. I've never done anything like that before, and it was highly embarrassing. I was watching that

first part through my fingers."

In another scene, "Lynn (her character) has moved in with her lover, but he's going to leave her to go back to his wife," Baxter-Birney explains. "Lynn has been terrorizing his wife, and she's starting to go crazy. He comes back to tell her to leave his wife alone, and she thinks he's come back to be with her. It's this terrible misunderstanding and letdown."

"Anyway," she continues, "we shot in Vancouver, and that was the coldest winter on record. We used this rain machine, but it was so cold that when the rain hit the ground it turned into snow and slush. I had to go running outside in this skimpy nightgown and get hysterical and have an emotional breakdown. I can't act by just using what's on the page — I have to find something that will allow me to get that point, to imagine something awful. I had to do the scene twice — once with the rainmaker, and once without — and when I was done, I was just sobbing. It was bitter cold, and they took me inside and wrapped me up — and

after that, I couldn't remember anything about it. I'd used up everything I had. All I remembered was doing that scene and telling the crew that when I did the scene I was really going to be out there, giving it all I had, so could they please get it."

Baxter-Birney is quite honest about what she considers to be good work. She dismisses one TV movie she did as a piece of fluff and admits that although she tries to be guided by the quality of the script, other considerations sometimes take over. "I'm considering this one project," she confides, "that's not really great, but it shoots in Paris. I could take my kids to Paris! Can I set aside my principles to shoot there?" In the meantime, however, there's a more pressing problem. "I'm still driving around because I haven't found a place to park," she admits.

## Boomers are still targets

NEW YORK — In an industry where youth has been the watchword, Thomas Leahy, president of CBS marketing, is trying to persuade advertisers that they should put their dollars into his network because it has the oldest audience.

The advertisers agree CBS has the title for most mature viewers — the average age during prime time is 45 — but they say a younger audience still has its appeal. It's too hard to change the patterns of older consumers, they say, and still plenty profitable to appeal to the young.

Leahy, however, cites an expensive study commissioned by CBS as proof that aging Baby Boomers have the greatest economic value for advertisers. The study, he said, explodes "the myth" that young viewers, in the much-sought-after 18-49 age group, are more inclined

to switch brands and are more impressionable in the face of television commercials.

Leahy said the opposite is true, that the fiercest brand loyalty was found among women aged 18-24, while women in their 30s are more likely than their daughters to change their buying habits because of advertising.

He said the nation has "grown up in adoration of the young," and that advertisers have been led to believe falsely that if they can catch consumers when they are young, they will continue to buy their brands for the rest of their lives.

"The key demographic for the '90s is the 35-54 age group," Leahy said at a recent press conference. The average age of a prime-time viewer now is 44, and he predicted it will be 47 by 1995 and 49 by 2000, he said.

shooting with plans for an upcoming world tour. The man is a workhorse.

# Spring sweeps are now on the way, and CBS hit big time with 'Caroline?'

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Beleaguered CBS broke into the top 10 for the first time in three weeks — just in time for the spring sweeps — with the TV movie "Caroline?" which ranked fourth in the latest Nielsen ratings.

In Sunday night's TV movie free-for-all among the three major networks, Jim and Tammy Bakker's "Fall From Grace" on NBC didn't have a prayer against "Caroline?," the story of a supposedly dead woman who tries to convince her family that she's very much alive.

ABC's "Summer Dreams: The Story of the Beach Boys" wiped out in the same time slot, coming in 48th, according to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

For the week ended April 29, NBC was still the No. 1 network, with an average of 12.9. ABC scored an 11.4 average, and CBS 11.1. Each ratings point represents 921,000 households.

Although CBS remains in the ratings basement, it got a boost in the overall sweeps race — the ratings of which help set local stations' advertising rates — with Monday night's broadcast of the 39-year-old pilot for "I Love Lucy." The never-before-seen episode won

## 'Bagdad' may be headed for TV soon

NEW YORK — Since she and co-star Whoopi Goldberg were included in CBS' fall promos, Jean Stapleton feels confident "Bagdad Cafe" will be on the fall schedule.

Away from series television for 10 years, since the demise of "All in the Family," Stapleton is both happy and sad. Happy about her new TV berth and working with Goldberg ("a very bright, talented woman"), and sad about her favorite New York store, Bonwit Teller's, going out of business.

"I bought enough Italian leather handbags to last a lifetime. I estimate I saved \$500," she boasts.

Since she said goodbye to Edith Bunker, shedding the nickname "dingbat" given her by Carroll O'Connor (Archie Bunker), Stapleton's career has been filled with films — all good-woman roles, including playing Eleanor Roosevelt. And theater, her first love, including a stint in plays by Harold Pinter ("a very sexy guy"), and her return to Broadway in "Arsenic and Old Lace." She also starred in "The Late Christopher

Bean" and "The Mystery of Edwin Drood," which she took on tour.

"The casting community never typecast me as Edith Bunker," she says. "I never had trouble leaving the role behind me. The human mind doesn't work that way. I like diversity; I like doing theater.

Earlier in my career, I studied music. I did roles in musicals like "Damn Yankees," "Bells Are Ringing," Aunt Eller in "Oklahoma," and "The King and I." (If this brings to mind the high-pitched, off-key Edith screeching out "Those Were the Days," be advised that was a ruse; the lady can sing!)

One thing that helped separate her from Edith were her years in summer stock at the Totem Pole Playhouse in Fayetteville, Pa., which was operated by her late husband, William H. Putsch.

She no longer performs there, and her visits are "only on occasion to see a friend in a play," she says, a sad look quickly passing over her face. Since her high-profile days in "All in the Family," she adds, she

has become very protective of her private life, which includes that of her acting daughter, Pam, and son, John.

It was Mort Lochman, a friend from "All in the Family" days, and co-creator and producer (with Sy Rosen) of "Bagdad Cafe," who first approached her to do the series.

She recalls with amusement how she was told they were working on a deal with Whoopi Goldberg — and then Goldberg told her she had been told they were working on a deal with Stapleton.

As for "Bagdad": "This was the most creative idea that had come along. I liked the film by the same title, and the script really interested me." She expects her character of Jasmine, the lady who deserted her husband in the desert and arrived at Whoopi's cafe to evolve. "I like the audience to discover who she is. I see her as a very intelligent, sophisticated, cultivated woman from the East who is very much her own person. She stays on because she's not in a hurry and the people interest her."

# At the sound of the beep, try the TV

"Follow Citizen: You will carry a beeper" and a notebook at all hours of the day. When the beeper sounds, you will record your emotion on the pad."

What sounds like an Orwellian nightmare is actually the latest and perhaps most controversial gimmick in television research. George Gerbner, a professor at the University of Pennsylvania, questions the methodology.

In a 13-year study of television viewing in America recently released by Robert Kubey of Rutgers University and Mihaly Csikszentmihalyi of the University of Chicago, the researchers found that people are often passive, tense, unable to concentrate, bored and drowsy while watching TV — and grow increasingly irritable, even hostile, the longer they watch.

The researchers asked the 1,200 survey participants to carry pocket paging devices and to record their moods when the beepers sounded. This was an effort to find out how people feel before, during and after television viewing.

Gerbner, a prominent television scholar at Penn, questioned whether people would be honest about their feelings when responding to a beeper, or whether they would simply be annoyed by the beeper. Gerbner, a former dean of Penn's Annenberg School of Communications, praised the

method as a way to, with great regularity, "permit access to the spontaneous moods" of people watching TV.

But, he said, "in my opinion, it's somewhat contaminated by the beeping itself. It's highly artificial. They claim it's a natural environment, but that claim ignores the very nature of beeping ... and how do you know these moods were caused by television? These are difficult questions to control."

Although the researchers "have claimed a new level of anxiety" attributable to TV viewing, Gerbner is not surprised. Gerbner has been conducting a study of television viewing for 22 years, and years ago he reported the "gloom and doom" phenomenon.

"This study confirms most of the previous findings," he said. "We found that if people are gloomy, they will watch television. After watching it, they're even gloomier. Television doesn't do anything. Basically, television, although it has a lot of happy endings and happy talk, doesn't really seem to stimulate peoples' imagination and doesn't seem to cheer them up, and we're not sure why."

The new study also reported that blacks watch more TV than do whites or Hispanics. Gerbner, who, as executive editor of the quarterly Journal of Communication, published some of Kubey's research as early as 1986, was not surprised. "That's because of income, because of class

differential, not because someone is black or white," Gerbner said. "Poor whites will watch more than middle-class blacks. People of higher education and income, Kubey and earlier researchers found, generally watch television less and lead more diverse lives."

Overall, Gerbner termed the Kubey study "a good study that confirms a lot of earlier work." The Kubey assertion; for instance, that television brings the family together has been known "since the 1950s," Gerbner said.

"Researchers found that instead of roaming the streets or going to the pub people used to sit together and watch their favorite programs. You don't need any big study to see that. As a matter of fact, it happens today much less than it used to, because there's more than one set in many homes. People are sitting in the same house but not in front of the same TV set."

According to Gerbner's work, television's greatest power may be in what he calls "mainstreaming." Children of high-income, high-IQ parents tend to do worse in school if they watch a lot of TV; children of low-income families do better. Heavy-TV-watching suburbanites, in safe neighborhoods generally feel less secure when they watch TV; city residents in dangerous neighborhoods often feel more secure in the ubiquitous blue glow of the tube.

"TV," says Gerbner, "makes everyone middle class."
