Jones says 2-tier range study violates U.S. law

BOISE — The Air Force is violating Federal law with the two-tier study it designed to evaluate environmental impacts of the Saylor Creek Bombing Range expansion, Idaho's attorney general said Thursday.

"Both supporters and opponents of the range expansion should be concerned about the apparent failure to comply with the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)," Attorney General Jim Jones said in a letter to Senate Resources and Environment Chairman Laird Noh-R-Kimberly. "An environmental impact statement that does not meet the requirement of NEPA will be subject to court challenge by all affected parties," Jones said in an interview Thursday.

"If the Air Force is smart, they'll address it at this point instead of having it tossed out by the courts in a couple of years," he said.

Representatives of environmental groups opposing the range expansion plans said they hope the opinion will convince Air Force officials to drop the Saylor Creek proposal, or at least start the review process again.

"We are hopeful that the Air Force will abandon the EIS process it has embarked upon," said Dan Leiber, attorney for the Natural Resources Defense Council.

Noh requested the attorney general's legal opinion after the NRDC

and the Greater Owyhee Legal Defense group questioned the two-tier Environmental Impact Statement the Air Force is using to review the proposed range expansion.

The Tier One statement will examine whether the range expansion is needed outside the Mountain Home Air Force Base; Tier Two will examine the expansion's effects in detail.

Environmental groups opposing the Saylor Creek proposal contend that no decision to expand the range should be made without first studying its effects.

Jones concurred. "Because the proposal or decision under consideration in the Tier One DEIS (Draft Environmental Impact Statement) includes whether to proceed with the proposed expansion of the Saylor Creek Range and because

Traffic, trash cut into room at top of Mt. Everest

KATMANDU, Nepal — Traffic jams and landfills have come to Mount Everest, the roof of the world. A growing number of nature lovers, and the flags, clothes and oxygen tanks they leave behind, are turning parts of the majestic mountain into a garbage dump. And a crowd of one at that.

A long line of climbers snaked near Everest's peak Thursday, vying for elbow room on the top. Americans, New Zealanders, Swiss, Soviets, Chinese and Austrians queued up to reach the 29,028-foot summit.

One was Peter Hillary, the son of Sir Edmund Hillary, the first person to reach the summit. Hillary has expressed concern about damage to the fragile ecology of the Himalayas.

At least 17 people reached the crowded summit over the course of the day. Some came within minutes of each other. One group came from the north side, but the others hiked from the southeast, taking the traditional route made famous by Hillary, the New Zealander, and his first conqueror, Everest, with his Nepalese guide, Tenzing Norgay, on May 29, 1953.

Fortunately, Thursday's climbers did not all reach the summit at once. Everest's peak has room for only about 10 hikers.

It has been one of the mountain's busiest seasons. A Japanese team of three tried to fly over Everest, in the first attempt to buzz the peak in a hot air balloon. They crashed Wednesday and one man was hurt.

In late April, the Nepalese Tourist Administration said more than 100 people were climbing the mountain from the Nepalese side. Add to that a group of 30 climbers from a "peace group" of Soviets, Chinese and Americans, who attacked the mountain from Tibet.

Fortunately, Thursday's climbers did not all reach the summit at once. Everest's peak has room for only about 10 hikers.

Thousand Springs project still going, manager states

The project manager for the proposed massive Thousand Springs power project in northeastern Nevada is denying a report that the energy park is near death, but the editor who wrote the story says he's sticking with his sources.

"There is absolutely no validity in that rumor and we do not respond to rumors," Project Manager Joe Gremban said Wednesday in Reno, Nev.

The High Desert Advocate, a weekly newspaper in Wendover, reported that Sierra Pacific Resources had withdrawn from the consortium of utility companies and developers proposing the \$4 billion plant and that Gremban was on his way out as Sierra Pacific chairman.

Gremban has said he expects to retire this year, but not this month as the newspaper said.

Howard Copelan, editor of the High Desert Advocate, said he trusted the unnamed sources quoted in his story, adding that they came from inside and outside Sierra Pacific.

Rep. Richard H. Stallings, D-Idaho, has denounced the project because of the air pollution it would produce in southern Idaho while providing electricity for Nevada and California and Idaho. Attorney General Jim Jones has said he's opposed to it and might go to court to block its construction.

Their protest prompted Bureau of Land Management Director Cy Jameson to reopen his agency's environmental impact study on the project. The study is needed before the BLM can transfer of public lands to Sierra Pacific Resources.

Thousand Springs, a proposed 2,000-megawatt coal-fired plant, would be constructed over a 16-year period on 15,960 acres of BLM land northeast of Wells, Nev., near the Utah and Idaho borders.

Sen. Harry Reid, D-Utah, has endorsed the project because of the jobs it would produce.

Cocaine use level estimates double

WASHINGTON — About one in every 100 Americans — more than double the number previously estimated — use cocaine at least once a week, according to a Senate report released Thursday.

The report by the Senate Judiciary Committee, estimates that about 2.2 million Americans are "hard-core" cocaine addicts, meaning they use the drug once a week or more.

The only other previously published federal study had estimated 860,000 people were addicted to cocaine.

The drug policy has been shaped around the basic assumption that 860,000 people were addicts. We need a massive new effort if we're going to combat hard-core cocaine addiction," said Sen. Joseph Biden, D-DeL., chairman of the Judiciary Committee, who proposed a \$3 billion program of research, treatment and law enforcement grants.

The report by Biden said he has based on lower, inaccurate estimates and is aimed primarily at reducing casual use of cocaine. The new numbers, he said, indicate that the country's prevailing problem is addiction — not casual use — and the nation's strategy should be redirected.

New York state has the nation's highest total, 434,000 adult addicts, according to the report. But

House passes family leave bill

WASHINGTON — Discounting threats of a presidential veto, the House passed a bill Thursday that would require employers to grant workers up to three months of unpaid leave for personal illness and new children in the family.

Although a compromise version of the bill exempts 95 percent of American businesses, most business lobbies vigorously opposed it as an unwarranted intrusion by the government into companies' relations

with their employees. The bill passed by a hefty majority, 237-187, after its sponsors went along with a bipartisan compromise forged by Reps. Curt Weldon, R-Pa., and Bart Gordon, D-Tenn. The compromise reduced the amount of unpaid leave for personal illness and permanently exempted firms with fewer than 50 employees. An earlier version would have set the cutoff at 35 employees.

Described by sponsors as pro-family and by detractors as a burden on business, the bill attracted 198

Democrats and 39 Republicans. Fifty-four Democrats and 133 Republicans opposed it.

Idaho's two congressmen, Democrat Richard Stallings and Republican Larry Craig, voted against the measure.

Most women's groups, terming the legislation a boon to working mothers, strongly supported the bill — and that support was reflected in the way the House's 28 female members responded to it. Twenty-two voted for it, five against it, and one did not vote.

Budget summit could flop

WASHINGTON — As President Bush and Congress gear up for the third budget summit in four years, it's worth recalling that the previous two failed to bust the deficit down to manageable levels.

With such a record, a scene straight from the Peanuts comic strip comes to mind: Is Lucy waiting to snatch it away? The reason the summit could flop is simple. All the taxing and program-cutting options that will be on the table Tuesday when the talks begin can be summed up in one word: pain.

And how much pain can the Republicans and Democrats dish out in an election year without risking a backlash from their constituents?

"We may not succeed," said Sen. Bob Dole, R-Kan. "It's like putting Humpty Dumpty together

again. It's not impossible, but it's almost."

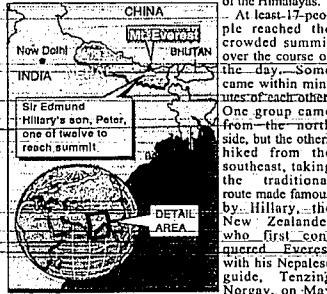
That some of the president's men are trying to pin the dreaded T-word on the long-suffering Democratic donkey doesn't help matters.

Chief of Staff John Sununu, flying home from an official visit to Costa Rica, told reporters any tax proposal would have to come from the Democrats, and the administration is prepared to reject them. Sununu's words would seem to diminish the likelihood of a compromise.

Many politicians in both parties simply prefer slogans to fiscal responsibility. But in the administration and in Congress there are some seasoned, savvy players who have not given up on achieving a rational budget compromise.

This group includes people like budget director Richard Darman, House budget chairman Leon Panetta, D-Calif., and New Mexico Sen. Pete Domenici, the ranking Republican on the Senate Budget Committee. They remain partisan, and they

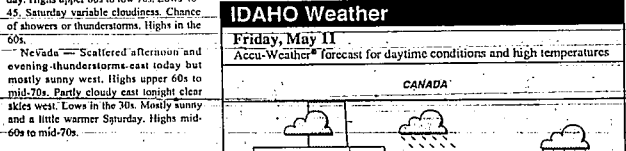
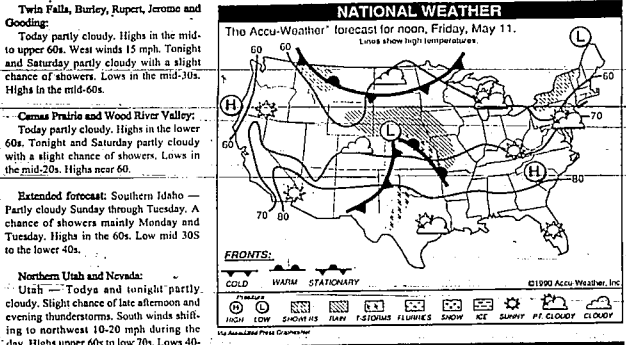

Woman held in infant's drug death

CALDWELL (AP) — An Idaho woman was being held in the Canyon County jail Thursday after being arrested for the cocaine overdose death of her infant son last month.
 Maria Reyes, 22, who moved to Mountain Home from Caldwell earlier this week, was arrested by authorities on Wednesday after her indictment by a county grand jury on a charge of causing felony injury to a child.
 If convicted, she faces up to 10 years in prison.
 Police Chief Bob Sobba said the investigation began April 17, the day Reyes' 2-month-old son, Fabian, died of what first appeared to be Sudden Infant Death Syndrome at an apartment where Reyes lived.

PUC member sentenced for DUI

BOISE (AP) — Idaho Public Utilities Commissioner Perry Swisher has been fined, given a suspended jail sentence and had his driver's license suspended in connection with a March 13 misdemeanor charge of driving under the influence.
 Swisher, who refused to take a blood alcohol test, pleaded guilty to a charge of inattentive driving and lost all driving privileges for six months. He also received a suspended 10-day jail sentence and was fined \$300 plus court costs.
 "There was enough evidence, in my opinion, to suspend him for his refusal (to take a blood alcohol test)," said William Nary, assistant city attorney. "But there wasn't enough evidence to prove beyond a reasonable doubt that he was under the influence."

Group opposes Payette River plan

BOISE (AP) — A Payette River citizens committee says it wants water officials to turn back a proposed protection plan for the Payette River because it has serious flaws and was hurried in its development.
 But Payette River advocates accused two hydro developers on the committee of scaring Boise County residents with "bogus" economic benefits to get them to oppose protection of the river.
 The plan advocates protecting the Payette's Main, South and North forks from hydroelectric development and preserving their natural, whitewater and recreational attributes.

Givens backs wilderness mediation

LEWISTON (AP) — First Congressional district hopeful Jeanne Givens says she still supports the Idaho Legislature's wilderness mediation process, despite the fact that three conservation groups earlier pulled out of the program.
 The Democratic challenger said "this is an historic opportunity for the environmental community to participate in an Idaho version of a wilderness bill." Mrs. Givens outlined her position during an interview and during an appearance on the KRLC radio talk show, "Opinion Please."

Judge reopens case for psychiatrist

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — A 1st District Court judge has ordered the Idaho Board of Medicine to reopen testimony for a Coeur d'Alene psychiatrist whose license was revoked for alleged sexual relations with patients.
 Judge Gary Haman said Tuesday there was a question about a tape that was used as evidence in the Board of Medicine's hearing on allegations against Dr. Joseph Leggett.
 An order was given for the medical board to take the new testimony from Leggett within 60 days. Haman said Wednesday more time would be granted if needed by one of the sides.

U of I administrator to wear new hat

MOSCOW (AP) — University of Idaho administrator George M. Simmons will be wearing two hats for the next few years.
 Simmons, assistant vice president for academic affairs, also will serve as dean of the college of art and architecture for the next two years, starting June.
 Thomas O. Bell, UI academic vice president, said Wednesday the university hasn't been able to find "an appropriate match" between the dean's position and any of the candidates in two national searches.
 Bell said in a news release that UI President Elisabeth A. Zinser and he are "both pleased with the considerable support" for Simmons' appointment, made after consulting with the search committee and department chairs in the college.

Conference examines the homeless

POCATELLO (AP) — While poverty is the major force behind America's expanding homeless population, experts say many have mental problems that cannot be treated in just brief encounters with professionals.
 Sharon Farnby from the Division of Community Psychiatry at the University of Washington opened a conference on the homeless in Pocatello Thursday, saying professionals will not be able to make any progress treating mental, educational or other problems plaguing the homeless until basic needs like food have been met.

Sheriffs irked by concealed weapons law

What had been billed as a compromise for revising state law on the issuance of concealed weapons permits is now drawing fire from Idaho sheriffs.
 "They fear the looming new law will create too many new problems while dramatically increasing the number of legally concealed weapons in the state."
 "This is no good," said Fremont County Sheriff Terry Thompson, president of the Idaho Sheriff's Association. "This one has some real serious problems."
 The legislation, sponsored by

Senate Democratic Floor Leader Bruce Sweeney of Lewiston, goes into effect July 1. Based on a longstanding concealed weapons law in Washington state, it is intended to standardize the issuance

of permits to carry concealed weapons in Idaho and make those permits, now good only the county of issuance, valid statewide.
 Sheriffs, who are charged with issuing the permits, are meeting in a series of regional sessions that will culminate with a statewide meeting next month in Bonners Ferry in an attempt to adopt a common approach to implementing the law.
 Up to now, sheriffs around the state have been wont to issue concealed weapons permits, to a great extent because they remain liable for actions resulting from the permit.
 "The new law relieves them of that liability, but at the same time it mandates circumstances under which permits cannot be denied."
 "It does not give us any options," said Ada County Sheriff Vaughn Killeen, chairman of the association's concealed weapons permit committee.
 "I don't like it," Killeen said. "I don't like it in this day and age to have a bunch of people walking around carrying concealed weapons is not very civilized. It's not that the citizens of Idaho have been attacked and raped and pillaged."
 Under the new law, applicant fingerprinting is at the discretion of the sheriff.

Stallings: Idaho must help pay for clean air

POCATELLO (AP) — The benefits of sweeping revisions in the nation's Clean Air Act may not be seen for much of Idaho, but the state should still help pay for the bill, Democratic Congressman Richard Stallings says.
 With a media blitz under way by opponents of the pending legislation, urging people to tell their congressmen to oppose the bill, Stallings told the students of Idaho State University student group Thursday that they should back the bill that will significantly restrict most forms of air pollution.
 Stallings said in the telephone hookup to his Washington office that he will probably support the House version of the bill that will impose even stricter automobile and factory emission standards than the version already endorsed by the Senate.
 "We in Idaho probably won't notice significant differences," Stallings told the students. "You might in Pocatello more than anywhere else in the state. But I would think, statewide, Idaho will end up paying for those programs

that will benefit Los Angeles. ... Now that doesn't mean, therefore, we in Idaho should object."
 His view ran counter to that of Republican Sen. Steve Symms, who talked with the students last month. Symms voted against the Senate bill, claiming the benefits were not worth its multibillion-dollar price tag that could financially undermine the nation's businesses.
 "It's not going to come out of business' pockets," Stallings said. "It's not going to come out of industry's pockets."
 "It will be taken from consumers. If they place more cleansing machinery on automobiles, that will be realized in the price of a new car. General Motors is not going to pay that out of the goodness of their heart. They'll merely pass it on to buyers."

Symms' warned that the restrictions could keep business from locating in Pocatello, but Stallings flatly disagreed.
 "I can tell you that Pocatello has had some problems in the past recruiting businesses and getting industry to locate because of the air quality," he said.
 "It has not necessarily been totally responsible for driving them into other areas, but it is not something that has hindered business to locate in Pocatello."

Regional panel struggles with 20-year power plan

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — As the Northwest Power Planning Council works to develop a 20-year power plan for the region, members are still struggling with how best to use coal-fired and nuclear energy in an era of dwindling hydroelectric resources.
 The council is meeting through the night in Idaho Falls.
 "We're faced with a power shortfall," Oregon council member Ted Hallock said, reminding the panel it must take its responsibility seriously and not make "a child's decision."
 He requested a full scientific hearing on the nuclear issue before the council decides whether two Washington Public Power Supply System reactors should be included in the 20-year plan.
 To continue work on the draft plan, the council also needs to determine if resource priorities should be adjusted to reflect environmental concerns, and if any

power-production alternatives should be excluded from the portfolio.
 Besides considering the energy supply of the region including Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana, the council is charged with ensuring the Northwest is able to obtain enough electricity to meet its needs at a reasonable cost.
 Jim Litchfield, director of the council's power planning division, said Wednesday that the supply goal can be partially met through continued conservation efforts and small, relatively inexpensive new generating projects.
 The council is expected to release a draft of the entire new power plan this summer for public review. Comment of this draft plan will be taken over an extended period, and public hearings will be held.

Marine comforts cow evacuated from flooded Texas ranch Wednesday

EUFAULA, Okla. (AP) — Lake Eufaula, the reservoir some call a "gentle giant," has turned into a menace as farmers and residents hundreds of miles away in Arkansas battle floods unleashed from the lake because of heavy rains.

But U.S. Army Corps of Engineers officials, criticized about the timing of the release of water from reservoirs, are standing their ground. Were it not for reservoirs like Eufaula on the Arkansas River and Lake Texoma on the Red River, the flooding downstream could have been much worse, they say.

Decisions made by the Corps on how fast to release water from the reservoirs it manages can have a crucial effect on who is flooded, and how severely.

A too-early release of water through the dam's floodgates after a heavy rain increases flooding downstream, while slower release can mean more flooding upstream if the reservoir fills up.

Questions about the management of the reservoirs was raised on Wednesday when Arkansas Gov. Bill Clinton met with a group of

angry farmers and agreed with a suggestion that a study of Corps efforts to control Red River floodwaters might be in order.

But in the main, said Corps spokesman Ross Adkins, the reservoirs have done their job this past week.

"Our projects operated as they were designed to. We managed them just exactly as they were designed to operate," said Adkins.

"What we do is capture all the water we can to minimize any damages downstream. When Mother Nature dumps as much rain as we had ... (the reservoirs) took off a heck of a big bump that could have gone downstream."

"If we had not been here, a lot more houses and perhaps lives would have been lost," he said.

The flooding on the Trinity, Red and Arkansas rivers was touched off by severe storms last week. Some areas of eastern Oklahoma, already saturated from a wet spring, had as much as 12 inches of rain.

Thirteen deaths were blamed on the storm, most of them in Texas. Complete damage figures for the

region were not yet compiled, but the Red Corp. says as many as 600 homes in Oklahoma may have been damaged by the flooding.

In Texas, estimated damage to agricultural production stands at \$500 million and \$700 million.

As the water moved downstream from here, Arkansas has experienced some of the worst flooding in decades as the Arkansas and Red rivers flowed over their banks. Hundreds of homes have been damaged.

The Arkansas created at Pine Bluff in central Arkansas on

Wednesday, and the Red created near Texarkana, Texas, at the Texas-Arkansas line Thursday morning, but officials say rivers are receding so slowly and the ground is so saturated that the floodwaters will remain for days or even weeks.

After the rains, Lake Texoma, built in 1944, reached a record 644.76 feet, almost 27 feet above the normal level, and water roared over its spillway and down the Red River for the first time since 1957. Lake Eufaula, completed in 1964, also reached a record height.

Drug case against D.C. mayor grows

WASHINGTON (AP) — Federal prosecutors widened the criminal case against Mayor Marion Barry on Thursday, obtaining a new indictment that charges him with six additional misdemeanor drug crimes.

The broad new charges, added to a three-felony, five-misdemeanor indictment returned by the same grand jury in February, allege that Barry "possessed cocaine and crack with other co-conspirators at more than twenty locations, including private residences, hotels, government offices and business establishments and on boats."

Such drug activity took place in the nation's capital and other locations both inside and outside the United States, said the indictment, which did not name any of the people with whom Barry is accused of using drugs.

2nd virus may help AIDS virus work

WASHINGTON (AP) — A micro-organism discovered four years ago but ignored by most researchers is now being studied as a possible infection agent that may help the deadly work of the AIDS virus.

Shyh-Ching Lo, a virologist at the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology, first found the organism and claimed that it was a novel virus that he isolated from tumor cells in AIDS patients.

The findings were dismissed by most investigators and Lo now admits that it was for good reason. "The data were not very conclusive," Lo said in a report published Friday in the journal Science.

Ground victims settle air crash cases

MIAMI (AP) — Ground victims of the terrorist bombing of Pan Am's Flight 103 over Lockerbie, Scotland, have reached a settlement with the airline, an attorney for the victims said Thursday. All 259 passengers and crew aboard the plane were killed when the jet plowed into the quiet Scottish town Dec. 21, 1988. Eleven people on the ground were killed, a dozen others were injured and many homes were damaged or destroyed.

Greenspan touts reform of bank deposit insurance

WASHINGTON (AP) — Federal Reserve Chairman Alan Greenspan on Thursday outlined the central bank's ideas for reforming the nation's financial system, including changing banks' withdrawal investments more for their deposit insurance.

In his first extensive public remarks on deposit insurance reform, Greenspan told a Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago conference that the issue "should be high on our agenda" as Congress

and the Bush administration consider permitting banks to expand into securities and insurance.

Among the specific reforms he suggested were varying deposit insurance premiums according to the riskiness of a bank's investments, more frequently examining banks' books, more swiftly seizing weak banks and requiring bank owners to risk more of their own money.

Greenspan did not address such proposals as cutting back on \$100,000 per-account insurance

Manhattan pedestrians spend part of their lives in bus lane

NEW YORK (AP) — The pedestrian — the most flexible, inexpensive and pollution-free unit of transportation — is being driven into Manhattan streets by sidewalk obstructions.

Obstacles range from construction scaffolding to slow-moving out-of-towners.

This becomes apparent on the west side of Lexington Avenue each weekday afternoon at 5:23 when, according to scientific studies, the sidewalk between 42nd and 43rd Streets is the most crowded on the planet.

Almost 160 pedestrians a minute squeeze through a channel usually narrowed to 4 feet by newspaper vending machines, trash cans, street and traffic light poles, a newsstand, a table selling exotic oils and incense, a flower stand and a tank of refrigerated liquid nitrogen.

Something has to give, so the pedestrians step off the curb — a few at first, then more, until at least a third of the thousands streaming toward Grand Central Terminal are doing so in the dubious safety of the

Lexington Avenue bus lane.

"The pedestrian has been losing ground in the struggle for space in Manhattan," according to a report by the borough president's office, "and that is a serious problem in an environment which depends so heavily on walking for its mobility."

Another reminder of how serious a problem came last week.

Erica Moreno, 3, was walking hand-in-hand with her mother in 40th Street because a construction project had closed the sidewalk. A driver lost control of his car and smashed another vehicle into the girl, killing her.

Each year, cars and trucks in New York kill more than 600 pedestrians and injure 15,000. William H. Whyte, an urban planner who has counted and studied pedestrians on Lexington and streets all over the world, says New Yorkers try to bully cars with an attitude of "make way for me or kill me."

But walking is vital on a crowded island. 60 percent of eligible adults don't even have a driver's license, and Whyte says pedestrians

in Manhattan walk longer and faster than any place in America.

They need space, however, and Manhattan's already congested streets and sidewalks have been tied up by the financial services boom of the 1980s, which brought in more workers, and the attendant construction boom, which closed down more sidewalks.

Then there are tourists. A male New York pedestrian's cruising speed can exceed 350 feet a minute, visitors from less populous communities often move at 250 feet a minute, and they have been seen doing so three abreast. As a result, locals are always walking up the heels of out-of-towners.

But the biggest problem, in the dimension and condition of the city's pedestrian infrastructure — the sidewalks. On Lexington between 42nd and 60th much of the pavement is cracked or buckled, sloping in spots at 20 degrees. It is full of holes and hollows.

At 12th-foot, Lexington sidewalks are far narrower than Fifth Avenue's (22 feet).

Connecticut House sends gun control waiting period bill

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — Connecticut residents would have to wait two weeks before buying any gun so that authorities could conduct criminal background checks under a bill approved by the Legislature.

A national gun-control group pushing a similar bill at the federal level called the Connecticut vote Wednesday an important "common-

sense" victory.


But an anti-gun-control forces said bill would do nothing to keep firearms out of the hands of criminals.

Earlier this year, California became the first state to enact a waiting period law.

Gov. William A. O'Neill, a gun owner whose administration recently

put up \$25 million in state pension funds to save Colt's Manufacturing Co., a Hartford-based gun maker, has said he would sign the bill if it passed.

It would probably be at least a week before the paperwork reaches O'Neill's desk, gubernatorial spokesman Jon Sandberg said Thursday.

New audit sees more HUD losses

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal housing program including projects with golf courses and marinas likely will cost the government \$177-million-in-loan defaults, much of it on developments linked to political favoritism, according to an internal HUD investigation.

In a comprehensive review of the program, Department of Housing and Urban Development auditors said they found fresh evidence of mismanagement at the agency during the Reagan administration and new examples of influence peddling to sway HUD officials to approve risky projects.

The Title X land development program already has cost the government \$55 million and if defaults continue at current rates eventually will cost an additional \$122 million, the auditors said in reports completed last week. Favoritism played a role in several of the projects that have failed or are considered high risks to fail, according to the reports and HUD officials.

The reports, obtained through the Freedom of Information Act, blame the problems on Reagan-era abuses but said the losses continued to mount last year because Bush administration HUD Secretary Jack Kemp had not allocated enough staff to monitor the program. After prodding by HUD's inspector general, Kemp last week created a new unit to handle the program.

Several Title X projects were built alongside golf courses and include other resort-like amenities. Few catered to low- and moderate-income families. Kemp killed the program last year after a limited audit revealed a 50 percent default rate and the elegance of some of the developments.

Included in the new investigation was Bluewater Bay in Niceville, Fla., which received \$15.4 million in HUD-backed financing and includes tennis courts, bike and hiking trails, a swimming pool, restaurants, a shopping center, 27 holes of golf, a beach and a 120-slip marina.

Bluewater Bay was approved in April 1989.

Former Klan leader won't change mind

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — The president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference says he will talk about the human family when he teaches a race-relations course to Klansmen, but not all his students may be listening.

"I don't know what he's going to say, but he's not going to change my way of thinking," said Roger Handley, a former Ku Klux Klan leader in Birmingham who was accused of attacking an SCLC march in Decatur in 1979.

The Rev. Joseph Lowery, who organized the march, is to lead the course Saturday for the Klansmen as part of a court settlement growing out of the bloody clash.

Lowery said he plans to talk about "the oneness of the human family."

China releases pro-democracy protesters

BEIJING (AP) — China announced Thursday it had released 211 jailed pro-democracy protesters, including several prominent academics, in a move that appeared timed to head off possible U.S. trade sanctions.

Those released include Dai Qing, a leading journalist; Cao Siyuan, director of a social science research institute; and Li Honglin, head of the Fujian Provincial Academy of Social Sciences.

All signed petitions or otherwise showed support for the democratic

reforms demanded last spring by hundreds of thousands of protesters in Beijing and other cities. The protests ended in June when the army opened fire on the demonstrators, killing hundreds and possibly thousands.

The official Xinhua News Agency described those released as lawbreakers and said they were "given lenient treatment and released upon completion of investigations."

It inserted the word "former" before the titles of Ms. Dai and the

others, indicating they were fired while in prison.

"Coming back home was like a dream," Ms. Dai said, contacted at home by telephone. She said she was let out Wednesday. "After 10 months, my kitchen is like a stranger."

She declined to speak further, saying she would be arrested again if she talked to a reporter without permission.

Xinhua listed the names of only six of those released. None of the six was a student. Xinhua did not say if

any student leaders were among those released.

Students at Beijing University said they knew of no students who had recently been returned to campus.

Campus sources in Beijing have reported that several student activists were released in the past few weeks, but none was a top leader of the pro-democracy movement. Xinhua quoted an unidentified spokesman for the Public Security Ministry as saying only 431 "lawbreakers" involved in the rebellion are still being investigated.

S. Koreans clash with riot police

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — Radical students and dissidents fought riot police in street battles in Seoul and other cities Thursday for the second day, despite a government warning against violence.

Riot police moved swiftly to disperse the groups of 200 to 500 students who chanted "Down with President Roh Tae-woo!" during scattered protests in the capital.

Thousands of riot police were deployed in downtown areas. They tightened street checks and took away young pedestrians suspected of participating in the clashes.

Shortly before nightfall, riot troopers fired tear gas to disperse 1,500 students carrying firebombs who had occupied a main street on the eastern edge of downtown.

News reports said thousands of radical students armed with rocks, steel pipes and firebombs battled police Thursday outside about 40 campuses — or in the streets nationwide. Details were not given.

Police did not say how many people were arrested Thursday.

Police detained 1,864 people in Seoul and 15 other cities during Wednesday's street clashes, the largest and most violent since Roh took office in February 1988.

E. German workers demonstrate nationwide, demand protection

EAST BERLIN (AP) — Tens of thousands of East German workers put down their tools, closed classrooms and blocked borders Thursday to demand protection from the high unemployment that is expected to be the price of German unification.

The protests by teachers, textile workers and farmers were called by unions and lasted only a few hours. They were the latest and largest demonstrations of anxiety by a work force worried about what will happen July 1, when the Germans are to merge their economies and social institutions.

"We want to prevent the initiation of the monetary union from causing the social deterioration of our work force," Sigrid Jauregg, head of the textile workers union, told the government news agency ADN.

The protests were timed to coincide with a Parliament session in which lawmakers squabbled over the status of unification talks with West Germany and the deteriorating state of the East German economy. East Germany faces a year-end deficit of \$36.6-billion, inflation is rising rapidly and only 32 percent of the nation's industries are profitable,

Parliament Secretary Guenther Krause said. Fourteen percent of the businesses will go bankrupt and 54 percent are losing money, he said.

Krause, who leads an East German delegation negotiating the terms of unification with West Germany, urged a quick shift to a market economy as a way to economic recovery.

He criticized what he called a "far campaign by the left" aimed at triggering mass anxiety over the loss of huge subsidies under the former socialist system.

Krause said work on the final agreement between the Germans should be completed by Sunday. The parliaments of both nations then would consider the treaty, which is being negotiated by experts behind closed doors and still leaves many questions unanswered.

After the protests, Krause said discussions would begin next week with the 600,000-member farmworkers union and eventually all labor organizations, ADN said. The Germans have been negotiating on the draft of a state treaty under which East Germany's

economy and social structure would be absorbed by the West in six weeks.

Economists predict many inefficient East German factories will close in the next year because they will not be able to compete in the free market, and that between 500,000 and 2 million East German workers will lose their jobs.

Both West German Chancellor Helmut Kohl and East German Prime Minister Lothar de Maiziere say a quick influx of Western investment will create new jobs and raise East German living standards.

Baltics sign pacts; unity emerging

MOSCOW (AP) — The three separatist Baltic republics strengthened their solidarity Thursday, implementing an agricultural agreement that allows them to bypass Moscow and weighing a plan to coordinate their government policies.

Estonia proposed reviving a Council of Baltic States that was created in 1934 when the republics were independent. It would include the president, prime minister and foreign ministers of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania, said Valte Feldman, a spokesman for the Estonian Foreign Ministry.

Estonian President Arnold Ruitel invited Presidents Vytautas Landsbergis of Lithuania and Anatoly Gorbunov of Latvia to sign an agreement with him in Tallinn on Saturday. They did not respond immediately.

The three governments also implemented an agreement for the direct exchange of agricultural supplies and products, bypassing the central Soviet ministries and trade organizations that usually handle such transactions; the official Soviet news agency Tass reported.

Last month, the republics signed a package of agreements to integrate their economies, and the deals are being implemented in stages. Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev opposes "immediate independence for the Baltic republics, which were forcibly annexed."

WHO defers PLO voting rights

GENEVA (AP) — The World Health Organization indefinitely postponed a decision on whether to admit the P.L.O.'s State of Palestine as a full voting member, thus averting the threat of a withdrawal of U.S. funds.

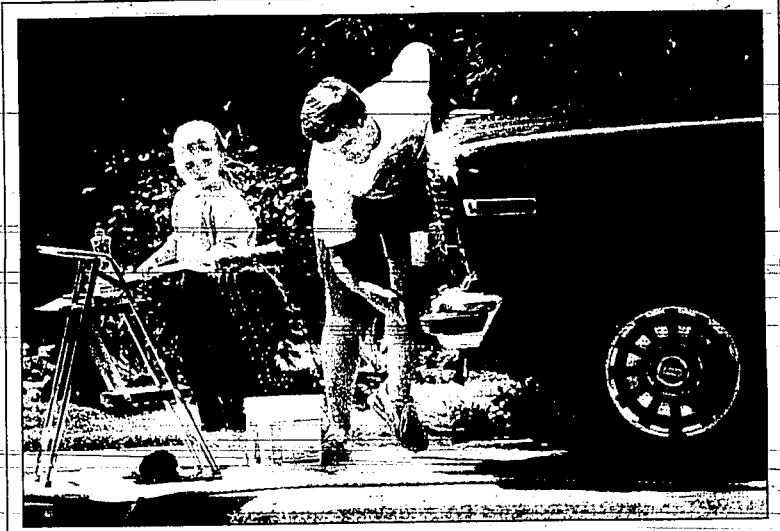

Newcomb wrote letter involving own shelter

TWIN FALLS — Republican Rep. Rissell Newcomb went to bat in June 1988 for his constituents who were tied up in the same Internal Revenue Service battle over a failed tax shelter that he was — but never mentioned he was involved.

Newcomb, who left the Legislature in 1988, wrote a letter to Democratic Congressman Richard Stallings asking him to help move the IRS toward settlement on a failed tax shelter used by dozens of local professionals. At the time, Newcomb was also negotiating with the IRS over the tax shelter.

"As an elected official, I have received many complaints from these individuals over the last eight months," Newcomb wrote on his legislative letterhead. "Many of them desired to settle this particular issue and get on with their lives."

His fellow professionals had asked him for help as an elected representative, Newcomb said Thursday in an interview during a court recess. Although he was also involved, Newcomb decided he could separate his personal interest from his duty as a representative.

He struggled with that particular thing, Newcomb said. "It was kind of a conflict, but as far as I was concerned, when I wrote that letter, I was representing a

bunch of people."

He also wrote that 16 of the physicians involved were trying to build a new clinic complex — and having problems arranging financing with a potentially large IRS settlement hanging over their heads.

He didn't mention that he was talking about the Twin Falls Clinic and Hospital, where he practiced.

The letter was written after Newcomb completed his first, and only, term in the Legislature during 1987 and 1988. He did not run for re-election in 1988.

Newcomb is running for the Legislature again. This time the Senate seat being vacated by Sen. Larry Anderson, R-Eden. He'll face Rep. Gary Robbins, D-Twin

Falls in the fall.

Newcomb's letter came after the U.S. Tax Court ruled the tax shelter, called Professional and Executive Leasing Inc., illegal. In a plan to maximize tax benefits, Professional Leasing hired professionals and leased them back to their practices.

Newcomb, in the approximately three years he was in the plan, put more than \$200,000 into a tax-deferred retirement plan. He eventually settled with the IRS for \$297,000.

But when Newcomb wrote Stallings, the IRS was delaying settlement until an advisory memorandum came from its national office. That's what Newcomb asked

Attorney: Surgeon talented at tax planning

TWIN FALLS — When he went to his annual tax planning sessions in the early 1980s, local surgeon Russell Newcomb often told his lawyers what to do.

"He was an exceptionally sophisticated person as far as tax planning was concerned," one of his former attorneys, M. Gary Atkinson testified earlier this week.

Newcomb, who kept meticulous financial records on a home computer, would often develop a better tax plan than Atkinson or his accountant, Atkinson said. The planning was fruitful, the IRS declared his tax shelter illegal and Newcomb even-

tually paid a \$297,000 settlement.

But Newcomb said he passed no legal judgment on the shelter, only using his computer to provide "timely, accurate" information on his finances to facilitate planning, he testified.

Newcomb said he had no idea the plan was risky, he said. That is why he sued Atkinson and Thomas G. Walker Jr., who hired Atkinson in the early 1980s.

Newcomb, who is running for a state Senate seat, says the attorneys improperly organized and operated Professional and Executive Leasing Inc.

Professional Leasing was declared illegal by the Internal Revenue Service, a decision upheld by the U.S. Tax Courts and

a federal appeals court.

Newcomb's lawyers rested their case Thursday after a week of testimony. The trial will resume Monday.

His case revolves around whether Walker and Atkinson told Newcomb that Professional Leasing was a risky plan, and whether Newcomb actually suffered any damages.

"I don't believe anybody lost any money," Walker testified. "They just had to pay their taxes plus interest."

The 55-year-old Newcomb, who paid a \$297,000 settlement to the IRS, says he is facing an early retirement brought on by a medical condition and will not have enough pension income. Nobody told him

Professional Leasing was risky, he says, and he wouldn't have jeopardized his retirement if he knew.

But Atkinson testified that he told Newcomb Professional Leasing was aggressive, and the IRS would probably audit him. Newcomb replied by saying, "I've gone through a lot of audits. Audits don't scare me," Atkinson testified.

Atkinson would usually talk to Newcomb at 7-year-end tax planning sessions while Newcomb was signed on to Professional Leasing. Newcomb first signed up with Professional Leasing on April 1, 1983, and resigned in late 1985.

In the plan, Newcomb paid no taxes on

Castleford council will get tough with water users

CASTLEFORD — City Council members decided Wednesday to get serious about water.

City officials will begin randomly checking residents' homes throughout the summer to ensure they're following a summer watering schedule and the city will shut off water to residents whose bills are too much overdue.

The council earlier this year decided that residents, with house numbers ending with an odd number should water on odd-numbered days and those with even house num-

bers water on even-numbered days.

"The city just doesn't have enough water pressure if everyone waters on the same day," City Clerk Patsy Kinyon said. The school is watering only at night, "and that will help," she said.

Kinyon said some residents apparently want to follow the system but are using their old house numbers, not the new ones — set a few years ago.

The city will notify people who aren't complying, but council members made no decision to do that to do about anyone who continues to violate the schedule.

The council also decided to begin enforcing its ordinance that allows the city to shut

off water to residents whose bills are unpaid for two consecutive months, although the city will consider extenuating circumstances.

Unpaid water bills, many of them by a small number of residents, have been a continual problem in Castleford for some time.

The council decided Wednesday to crack down on the problem.

The city can shut off the water without notification. Residents will be will be required to pay their water bills up to date, plus a \$10 turn-on fee, to have their water turned back on.

Also, any residents whose checks are returned to the city for insufficient funds will

be charged a \$10 fee.

In other matters, the Castleford Volunteer Fire Department is planning its second annual street dance on June 23 as a fund-raiser.

The band will be Renegade and tickets will be available from department members and at City Hall beginning June 1.

The mayor's seat, currently held by Richard Schulz, and the two council positions now held by Mary Pinkston and John Crowley will be up for re-election in November.

Candidate petition forms will be at J & D Printing in Castleford later this summer.

Twilegar defends transactions by his company

BOISE (AP) — Democratic U.S. Senate hopeful Ron Twilegar on Thursday defended specific financial transactions of his failed venture capital company, again rejecting his opponent's charges of fiscal misconduct in Twilegar's handling of the company.

The Boise businessman and former state Senate minority floor leader maintained every action taken in connection with the company was to preserve its assets and assure a maximum return to all creditors and investors.

Campaign officials also reiterated that there was nothing improper about the operation of the First Idaho Venture Capital Co., which defaulted on \$3 million in loans guaranteed by the Small Business Administration in 1986.

The company, which financed high-risk new businesses throughout rural Idaho, went into voluntary receivership last fall in preparation for liquidation of the assets to repay the SBA loans and \$1.5 million in interest on them and possibly

reimburse Twilegar and 1,600 other stockholders the \$1.5 million they paid for the enterprise.

SBA officials have described the company's financial demise as not unusual in comparison to the scores of defunct venture capital companies it has financed.

In their four-hour statewide televised debate Wednesday night, challenger David Sweet, who is in court fighting the foreclosure on another failed Twilegar dealership, he has an interest in, accused Twilegar of refusing to let SBA officials in on the financial status of the company between the time of the initial default and the receivership — a period when he claimed it was spending hundreds of thousands of dollars on items other than loan repayments.

The allegation was based on a Nov. 28, 1988 letter to Twilegar, president of the venture capital company, from SBA Commercial Loan Specialist John Anderson. Anderson questioned "an

unacceptably high level of expenditures" for the period of the \$1.5 million they paid for the enterprise.

Twilegar said he had no idea how much the company had spent on items other than loan repayments. He denied SBA charges that he had used the company's assets to pay for his personal expenses.

Twilegar had rejected the SBA's proposal that the failed venture capital company unconditionally turn over all its assets to the government in return for a release from its financial obligations to the SBA.

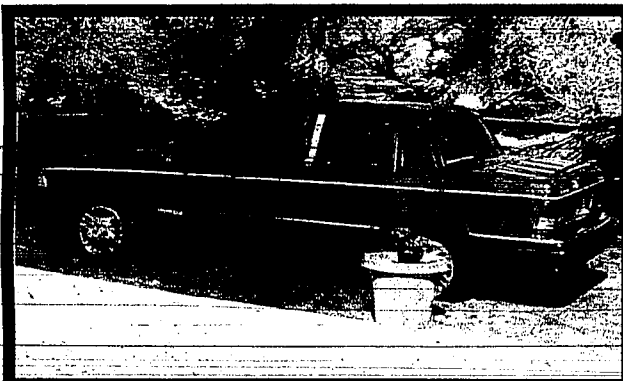

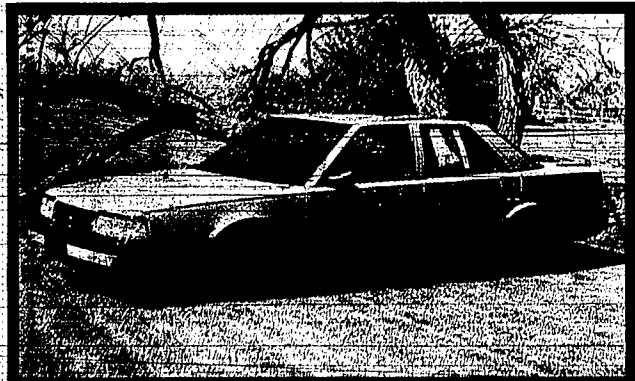

Williams, who took the job at ISU in late March, had previously signed high school seniors Kareem Carpenter and Jessie Shiel.

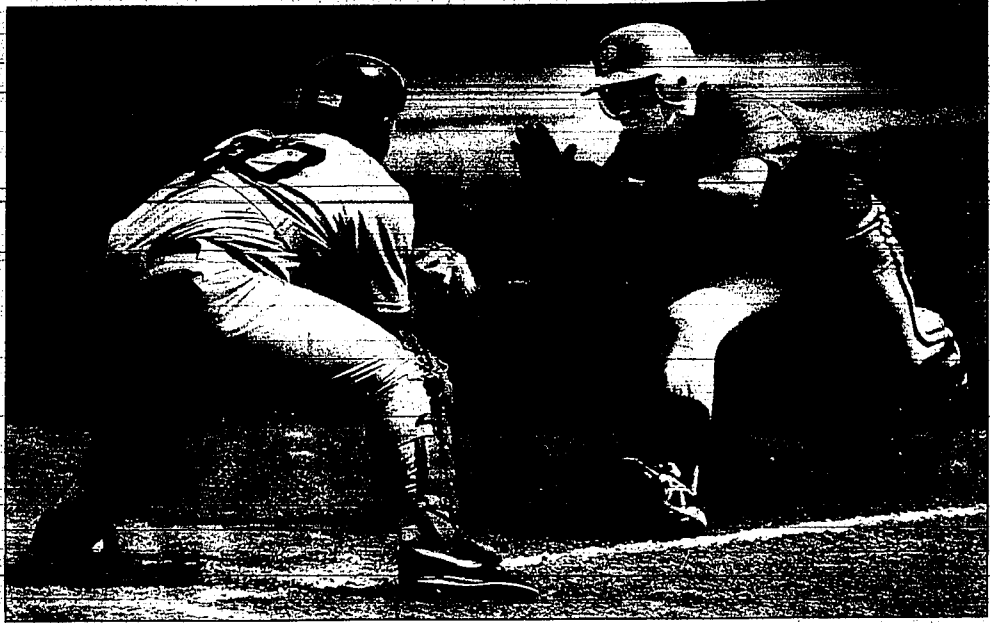

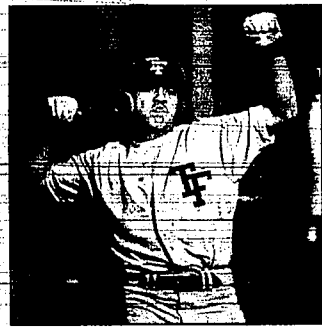

Bruins slip by Poky 4-3 in extra innings

TWIN FALLS — The Twin Falls Bruins, hitless through the final three innings Thursday, nonetheless capitalized on some backfired strategy to earn a 4-3 decision over Pocatello in extra innings for the Region III baseball tournament title.

Not only was it Twin Falls' 16th consecutive victory, but in winning for the 24th time in 26 outings, the Bruins qualified for the state A-1 tournament which begins in Boise on May 17.

Griggs got Bruin left fielder Steve Bartholomew on a ground ball, but with the top of the Twin Falls order coming to bat, the Indians decided to allow Bobby Jenco to fill the bases. The play failed when Torrey Bollinger 0-3 on Thursday, watched Griggs' full count fastball bounce right of the plate.

"I thought the second strike was a little outside," Bollinger said afterwards. "But it didn't make any difference. I was going to swing at the last pitch if it were anyplace close, but it happened to be in the dirt."

It was Bollinger's diving catch of Bell's seventh-inning wind-blown drive to left centerfield with one out and runners a first and second which kept Pocatello from claiming victory in regulation.

"I got a pretty good jump on the ball," he said. "I knew I could get it if I kept on booking out, but I still had to dive for it."

Wolfenbarger then disdained a 3-0 count, lining a hard shot left of second that Remussen juggled momentarily before stepping on the bag to finish the pitching staff.

"He became an infidel hesitating between two mosques."
— Turkish proverb.

How does South decline between two similar-looking finesses in the minor suits? The daily horseman won't provide the answer. Clear thinking and logical reasoning offer the best hope.

West cashes his two top hearts and switches safely to a trump. South wins, draws a second round to split the suit and is now faced with a choice in the minor suits. Which suit comes first?

There's more to it than deciding on priority. If both finesses are offside, finessing in the normal way will end in failure. How should South reach a logical conclusion?

The bidding and play thus far provide a big clue. West failed to open the bidding and is known to have held the two top hearts. Surely he can have no more than one of the missing kings. If this is true, the game cannot be defeated.

South enters dummy by ruffing his third heart and leads a low diamond from dummy. East must take his king or lose it. If East wins South wins East's exit, cashes his diamond jack and crosses to dummy to discard his two low clubs.

If West had won South's diamond jack with his king, East would then be sure to have the club king. South could then lose no club trick, taking one normal finesse in clubs and discarding one club on one of dummy's high diamond honors.

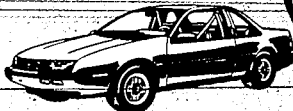

'Desert and a Dream'

Wendell composer writes play about town history

WENDELL—After months of reading historical records and pioneer memoirs, a Wendell resident has written a play that brings the town's history to life.

Children sign about watering the 1,200 trees that townsfolk planted in just three days and character actors take the spotlight one at a time to tell of their early-day experiences in the Hub City.

"The thing that impressed me the most was how tough it was for these people just starting out and what kind of determination and fortitude they had to have," said Ann Lorraine Smith, writer and composer. "They didn't have a decent water supply until 1927, and yet the canals were opened in 1909. What do you do for 18 years, waiting for the water, to finally have enough?"

About 25 cast members, directed by Smith, will perform "Desert and a Dream" at 8 p.m. on May 19 at the Ace Theater in

Wendell.

Last year, the Community Arts Council asked Smith to write a play about the settlement of Wendell. After researching the history, Smith produced this work which includes three original songs.

A Wendell native who graduated from high school here in 1972, Smith has a master's degree in music from the University of Idaho and is the band instructor for the Wendell Junior High and High School.

"Desert and a Dream" brings to life such characters as William Kuhn, a financier from Pennsylvania who followed the advice of I. B. Perrine and built a canal system on the north side of the Snake River Canyon, little knowing the tremendous problems he would encounter.

Major Fred Reed, a land agent and publicity man, tells how he went back East and convinced people to buy land on the new Wendell tract. Plant orchards and make your fortune, Reed told them. But the orchards dried up or froze every year and the

settlers who stayed eventually turned to farming.

"A banker's wife takes the spotlight and tells about how she got stuck in the deep mud while walking across Idaho Street and was rescued by men on horses."

"I gave the actors their choice (of parts to play) and the option to add whatever they want," Smith said. "The idea is for them to paint a portrait of the person they are portraying."

Ardrith Klein, the wife of a Presbyterian minister in Wendell, has taken the part of Mrs. Robert Koffend, wife of Wendell's first Presbyterian minister.

Researching early records of the church and minutes of church group meetings, Klein selected her favorite facts and anecdotes to use on stage. Dressed in 1910 attire, she tells of the 25-cent annual dues to the Missionary Society of the tent where services were first held and of moving a ladies' meeting to a downtown store where there was a stove to keep everyone warm.

Bob Burks, the grandson of a Kuhn canal builder, also wrote much of his own part. Assistant director Linda Hillis said the background scenery is a painting of the Wendell Motel, now the Magic Valley Manor, where the first settlers stayed and socialized.

The Arts Council has just purchased a new \$4,200 sound system, Hillis said. "I think it's going to be exciting," Hillis said. "We're trying really hard to get a little bit of culture in Wendell, so I hope people support us. We need to fill up the seats."

"Ticket price has not been set yet," she said.

Hillis said Smith is very talented and that her work proves it.

One humorous song is about chasing cows, a song most farmers can relate to and Smith said the final song is about heritage. "It's a pioneer heritage of people who were determined to make something out of a desert," she explained. "It's a heritage of hard work and a dream that came true."

Valley council requests letters supporting NEA

TWIN FALLS—Describing recent attacks against the National Endowment for the Arts as an affront to freedom of speech, the Magic Valley Arts Council has asked arts supporters to write legislators to express backing for the agency.

The NEA, which spent last fall mired in controversy over its funding of two groups that mounted controversial art exhibits, has again been under fire. This time, a group called the American Family Association has asked for Congress to deny funding to the NEA.

Like every federal agency, the NEA must be reauthorized by Congress every five years. The American Family Association recently published a full-page ad in USA Today, asking "Is This How You Want Your Tax Dollars Spent?" and listing a number of controversial projects it said were funded by the NEA.

The arts agency countered that most of the advertisement's charges were "distorted, inflammatory and inaccurate." Arts advocates also note that, of about 80,000 grants given by the NEA since its inception in 1965, only a handful have been controversial.

"When you support creativity, it means taking some risks," said Margot Knight, new executive director of the Idaho Commission on the Arts. The risks are worth taking, she added, especially since good art

and good ideas usually drive out the bad.

Short of abolishing the NEA entirely, many of its critics would like to see Congress impose content restrictions on grant recipients. To counter that movement, the National Assembly of State Arts Agencies has introduced a set of proposals aiming to improve the NEA's accountability in awarding grants.

The suggestions include an expanded National Council on the Arts, which advises the endowment; more cultural and geographic diversity on the endowment's advisory panels; open meetings; and an appeals process.

Alice Elwood, Magic Valley Arts Council coordinator, last week asked members at the group's annual meeting to write Rep. Richard Stallings expressing support for the NEA.

She urged people to express the good the NEA has done for the arts in the area communities, noting that the NEA—either directly or through the Idaho Commission on the Arts—has helped fund the Herrett Museum, the Magic Valley Symphony and artists' residences in local schools.

It's unlikely that language restricting content would affect many Idaho artists, Elwood said. "But if we become so isolated and provincial that we don't care what's going on, it will eventually affect us," she added.

Elwood, who formerly was assistant director of the National Assembly of State

TV performers shun 'Dice Man'

NEW YORK—So this guy, Andrew Dice Clay, stand-up comedian, right? His jokes are filthy, his mouth is foul, and some cast members of this week's "Saturday Night Live" are refusing to work with him. Dice, is this an attitude, or what? 7

The Dice Man ain't Pee-wee Herman in a leather jacket, folks. Dice is an X-rated Fonzie, the archetypal corner wise-guy, a lewd, sexist muckpot artist for whom "brood" is a term of endearment and whose views on human sexuality verge on the anatomically incorrect.

Dice's comedy is deep, deep blue. He evokes "body fluids, orifices" and "how they get together on bad dates. His critics say his jokes are at best crude, and at worst angry, sexually violent, homophobic and bigoted.

Last year, MTV banned Clay for life after he delivered a monologue laced with lewd poetry and references to fat women and sex during the network's televised Music-Video Awards show. Clay and his defenders say the comedian is only "acting" Dice, that his humor mocks the Dice Man's attitudes and has enough truth in it to attract an audience of men and women who love him.

A successful comedy album and an HBO comedy special followed, and his first starring role in a feature film, "The Adventures of Ford Fairlane," opens this summer.

"I talk about what people do, think or say behind closed doors," Clay told Playboy magazine in a January interview. "As I tell the crowds, I don't write this material. You write it for me."

The current controversy began when Nora Dunn, a cast member on "Saturday Night Live" since the '85-'86 season, refused to perform on this week's show because she considers Clay's comedy

King Videocable adds Spanish-language channel

TWIN FALLS — Responding to a petition with more than 400 signatures from the Hispanic community, King Videocable has added Univision — a 24-hour Spanish-language channel — to its lineup.

Vince Thompson, King Videocable general manager, said the station made its debut last Saturday on Cinco de Mayo. It's available for viewers in Twin Falls, Kimberly and Hansen.

"We put it on to see what the response would be. So far it's been very good," said Thompson, who termed Univision's presence on cable "an indefinite experiment."

Much of Univision's programming originates from Mexico and Latin America, according to Thompson. Offerings include talk shows, news, soap operas and other entertainment. The station is seen locally on Channel 33. It's also been available in the Burley area for about a year.

In conjunction with Univision's

debut, HBO and Cinemax subscribers can now hear Spanish dialogue for about 20 movies per month on each channel via King Videocable's FM service.

The service is free to all cable subscribers, although patrons must buy a signal splitter to use in wiring their FM receiver. The splitters, about \$4.95, are available at King Videocable and at many electronics stores.

In other news, Thompson said the two Syndex-affected signals — KBCI

and KSL — will soon be replaced by a service called Movietime (which will change its name to E1 — Entertainment Television June 1) during times when the signals must be blocked due to duplicate programming on the Syndex-protected local channels.

Syndex went into effect Jan. 1 and permits local broadcasters to request a blackout of any programming on other channels that airs from one day before to seven days following its showing on the local affiliate. Both KMYT and KKVI, the local CBS and ABC affiliates, requested the protection.

Movietime offers news and reviews of the latest film releases, Hollywood premieres and television programs. It will be on beginning sometime next week, Thompson said.

Mostly for fun: Some new books

TV Guide, People magazine, cereal boxes — not everything we read is classic literature. The following new books are mostly just fun.

MY PLACE

By Nadia Wheatley and Dawn Robb — Australia in Print Inc. (48 pages, \$14.95)

"My Place" helps readers travel into the past, where they find they have much in common with the children they meet. They also learn that any place has a story as old as time, as old as the land.

This is one of the best new books I have seen for older readers, age 10 and up. Each double-page spread captures a young person in a period in time, beginning in 1988 and going back 200 years.

The remarkable, panoramic illustrations by Donna Rawlins are exquisitely detailed. Type and art elements present social studies, pop culture and history in terms a child can understand.

A note to parents: Kids will be curious after reading this. Be prepared to answer questions about Australia, about the Beatles, about your family and your place — whether that is a state or town or trechouse.

This book — Australia's children's book of the year for 1988 — has been available only recently in the United States, but has been used in classrooms in Australia. It was changed very little for the US market, and a glossary at the back explains indigenous phrases that would be unfamiliar to readers of any age.

DO LIKE KYLA

By Angela Johnson, Orchard Books (32 pages, \$14.95 hardcover)

A typical day in the life of two sisters, as told in simple terms by Angela Johnson, is accompanied by illustrations, beautifully done in oil, by James E. Ransome.

The little girl longs to do as her sister does, from the moment they get up until it's time to go to bed.

"In the morning my big sister Kyla stands at the window, tapping at the birds. I do like Kyla, only standing on the bed."

This book, best for kids ages 4-7, from preschool to second grade, is the kind of story that might make siblings get along a little better — at least long enough for older sibs to read it to a younger one.

BYOX

By Robert Wahl, Price Stern Sloan (30 pages, \$12.95 hardcover)

This is a fantasy book with charming illustrations by Robert Wahl about tamed children, capitalist trapings and the wild side that lingers in all of us.

The text has especially nice rhythms for reading aloud to one child or a small group.

This book is especially suited to Readers' Theater, in which children can act out the parts of the wild kids:

"Some were Animal Growlers, growing animal talk. Lions, tigers and panthers followed them everywhere, even to bed."

"Some were Moonlight Prowlers, prowling about at night. They dressed in crooked vines and old brown leaves and wore no shoes."

"Some were Jungle Creepers, who painted themselves in jungle colors. They kept to the thicket and were hard to see."

"And some were Crocodile Keepers. They lived near the pond and rode the scaly backs of their crocodiles."

I love how this sounds, and the illustrations are almost as whimsical as the images in your mind.

One thing I did not like about this story was the fact that the wild boys are lured into a strangers' house for clothes and toys and food — especially nutritionally empty foods such as cakes and cookies. (Although the sweets are served alongside a bowl of fruits, no one is eating those in any pictures.)

Another thing I did not appreciate was the sudden decimation of the wildlife on Tangled Hill. The boys are named Pyox, disappears, but the beasts are left without a home, a sad reflection of reality. Children should not accept on faith that animals pushed out of their natural habitats will find new places to prowl and growl.

Lucci receives another Emmy nomination

NEW YORK (AP) — ABC soap opera star Susan Lucci, always an Emmy nominee but never a winner, was nominated for her 11th Emmy in as many years as a total of 205 daytime Emmy nominations were announced here.

CBS shows easily lead the nominations, getting 74, followed by 39 for ABC, 30 for NBC, 29 for PBS, and 29 for syndicated programs. There only were two cable nominees.

There also will be a non-tevised Emmy ceremony in Los Angeles on June 23, primarily for winners in such creative arts categories as hair design, makeup, editing, and graphics and title design.

Geraldo Rivera's syndicated "Geraldo" wasn't cited, though, and the only network morning show nominated for Emmy honors was ABC's top-rated "Good Morning America," which got two nominations.

CBS' "The Young and the Restless" and "The View and the Restless" led the pack with 14 nominations each, followed by 13 for ABC's "All My Children" in which Lucci stars and 12 for CBS' "Pee-Wee's Playhouse."

One was for a Home Box Office special, "Buy Me That" which warned parents and kids of deceptive advertising, and another for the lighting of an MTV special, "Club MTV."

The nominations in 51 categories were jointly announced by the Los Angeles-based Academy of Television Arts and Sciences and the New York-based National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences.

CBS' "The Price Is Right" led the game show race with six nominations, followed by the syndicated "Jeopardy," which got four.

The nominations for the 17th annual Daytime Emmy Awards, even included two for rival awards show, NBC's "The 6th Annual Soap Opera Awards."

Winners in the major categories will be announced here on June 28 in a two-hour ABC broadcast hosted by Oprah Winfrey. The show will be aired live in the East at 3 p.m. EDT, but shown in the West on a tape-delay basis at 2 p.m. PDT.

In the talk show field, "The Joan Rivers Show" and "The Oprah Winfrey" show each got four nominations, followed by three for Phil Donahue's "Donahue" and two for Sally Jessy Raphael. All are syndicated series.

Although "Pee-Wee's Playhouse" was the most-nominated children's series, PBS' long-running "Sesame Street" got nine nominations, CBS' "Jim Henson's Muppet Babies" and PBS' "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood" and "Square One TV" each got four.

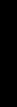

Dunne novel about revenge, murder becomes 'People Like Us' miniseries

By CONNIE PASSALACQUA

"Eerie, strange and eerie," says Dominick Dunne of the only day he visited the set of "People Like Us," an NBC miniseries airing Sunday and Monday, May 13 and 14 based on his best-selling roman a clef.

The strangeness issued not from the scene being shot — a New York high-society ball thrown by zillionaire Elias Renthal (Dennis Farina) and his wife, Ruby (Connie Sellecca), in which 10,000 specially imported butterflies, singed by the light, fall dead on the party-goers. Nor did the eeriness come from the fact that, as Vanity Fair magazine's noted profiler of the rich and famous, Dunne had attended so many real-life society parties like this one. It wasn't even because author Gus Bailey (Ben Gazzara), the miniseries' central character, is based on Dunne himself.

"Dunne says the sensation came from a feeling that, aside from contributing the original story — about Bailey's obsession with avenging his daughter's murder and the social-climbing Ruby's determination to hide a dark past — he had not very much else to do with it.

"I've closed the door on that part of my life," says Dunne, who for 25 years was a movie producer ("Ash Wednesday," "The Boys in the Band," "The Panic in Needle Park"). "Sure, I wonder how I would have done it," Dunne admits.

"There's nothing more fascinating than movie-making. But I'm awfully glad I don't have to do it. I was watching (miniseries executive

producer) Chuck McClain and there's so many people you have please: all the different people on the network level and on down."

Dunne says, as a writer, he's freer to control his own creations: "I love what I'm doing now. Writing these novels (including "The Two Mrs. Grenvilles," which was made into a 1987 miniseries, and "An Inconvenient Woman," just published) and working for Vanity Fair make for a spectacular life. Doing these articles has given me access to utterly fascinating people."

In "People Like Us," Dunne chronicles the New York society of the last eight years, with its influx of ostentatious nouveaux riches such as the Renthals. "There was such flaunting of wealth, parties like (the butterfly ball)," Dunne says. "It was appalling. That's why I wrote this book." While Dunne freely admits that many of the characters are based on real people, most are composites. "All these people fall into types anyway," Dunne explains. "They're so much more interesting that way, don't you think? There are at least

six tycoons who make up (Elias Renthal)."

Dunne agrees that an important plot thread comes from an incident in his own life that led to his fleeing Hollywood for a new life in New York. Gus is obsessed with the pending release from jail of his daughter's murderer. Dunne's own daughter, actress Dominique, was murdered in Los Angeles in 1982, and her murderer received a very light sentence. "I'm very sensitive about that," Dunne says. "In the book, my character is kind of an observer, but in the miniseries he's more central. That's the one thing I talked about with the producer from the beginning. I didn't want what was in the book greatly expanded. I haven't seen the (miniseries) yet, so I'm kind of nervous."

Comedy was crowned king last week, as Lucy, Roseanne tied for first place

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Everyone still loves Lucy, but maybe not as much as CBS does.

According to A.C. Nielsen figures released Tuesday, CBS' broadcast of "I Love Lucy, The Very First Show," tied with ABC's "Roseanne" as the most watched show on television last week.

And for the first time in more than a year, the troubled eye nearly caught up with NBC's peacock in the race for the top-rated network spot. CBS missed a first-place tie by only one tenth of a ratings point. It was the closest CBS has come to No. 1 since it tied with NBC in February of last year during CBS' broadcast of the epic mini-series "Lonesome Dove."

The previously untelevised 39-year-old "Lucy" pilot, made while Lucille Ball was six months pregnant with Lucie Arnaz, received a 21.2 average.

In the overall network battle, NBC finished first with 12.1, just barely ahead of CBS with an even 12.

ABC was third with 11.3. Each ratings point represents 921,000 households.

There was more for CBS to rejoice about during May Sweeps.

Future visits to the supermarket could be spent watching the tube

NEW YORK (AP) — Those supermarket tabloid headlines may have to get even wilder to hold their own against TV in the checkout aisle.

Cable giant Turner Broadcasting System Inc. and ActMedia, a marketing firm specializing in promotions in the store, said they are teaming up to design a TV service especially designed for shoppers lined up to pay for their groceries.

The Checkout Channel will feature news, sports and other specially tailored programming — plus advertising — on TV monitors placed above each checkout aisle.

Turner and ActMedia plans to test the service this summer and launch it nationally in early 1991, and hope to have it installed in 5,000 of the nation's 30,000 supermarkets by mid-1992.

Wayne W. LoCurto, chief executive and president of ActMedia, said the service should help advertisers reach 30 million to 40 million people each week while making the wait in the checkout line

more enjoyable for shoppers.

If the plan works, it would be the latest commercial encroachment into places that formerly were beyond the reach of television advertisers.

In recent months, media companies either have introduced or announced plans to develop commercial TV programs designed to reach teens in the classroom, women at the beauty salon and patients in the doctor's waiting room.

"There will be a few people to complain, but we believe the overwhelming majority of people will like it," LoCurto said in a telephone interview.

Atlanta-based Turner Broadcasting has agreed to create specially tailored programs of news, sports, business, weather and consumer information taken mainly from its Headline News cable network.

Each eight-minute program will include 2½ minutes of advertising commercials.

The programs will be delivered

by satellite 24 hours a day to participating stores, which will be equipped with TV monitors above each checkout aisle.

LoCurto said the sets will be designed so that the sound is shut off unless someone is within a half-dozen feet or so of the monitor. Once someone gets that close, there will be no way to shut the set off or adjust the volume, he said.

Turner and ActMedia plan to test the system from August through October in 12 stores in six cities, although they would not name the cities. LoCurto declined to give the cost of launching the system or the relative investments of Turner and ActMedia in the venture.

ActMedia, based in Darien, Conn., and a unit of Heritage Media Corp. of Dallas, Texas, was founded in 1973 and is the leader in in-store marketing programs.

The way the service is designed, it operates couponing and sampling programs and places advertising on shopping carts, aisle directories and store shelves in 20,000 supermarkets.

Future visits to the supermarket could be spent watching the tube

NEW YORK (AP) — Those supermarket tabloid headlines may have to get even wilder to hold their own against TV in the checkout aisle.

Cable giant Turner Broadcasting System Inc. and ActMedia, a marketing firm specializing in promotions in the store, said they are teaming up to design a TV service especially designed for shoppers lined up to pay for their groceries.

The Checkout Channel will feature news, sports and other specially tailored programming — plus advertising — on TV monitors placed above each checkout aisle.

Turner and ActMedia plans to test the service this summer and launch it nationally in early 1991, and hope to have it installed in 5,000 of the nation's 30,000 supermarkets by mid-1992.

Wayne W. LoCurto, chief executive and president of ActMedia, said the service should help advertisers reach 30 million to 40 million people each week while making the wait in the checkout line

more enjoyable for shoppers.

If the plan works, it would be the latest commercial encroachment into places that formerly were beyond the reach of television advertisers.

In recent months, media companies either have introduced or announced plans to develop commercial TV programs designed to reach teens in the classroom, women at the beauty salon and patients in the doctor's waiting room.

"There will be a few people to complain, but we believe the overwhelming majority of people will like it," LoCurto said in a telephone interview.

Atlanta-based Turner Broadcasting has agreed to create specially tailored programs of news, sports, business, weather and consumer information taken mainly from its Headline News cable network.

Each eight-minute program will include 2½ minutes of advertising commercials.

The programs will be delivered

by satellite 24 hours a day to participating stores, which will be equipped with TV monitors above each checkout aisle.

LoCurto said the sets will be designed so that the sound is shut off unless someone is within a half-dozen feet or so of the monitor. Once someone gets that close, there will be no way to shut the set off or adjust the volume, he said.

Turner and ActMedia plan to test the system from August through October in 12 stores in six cities, although they would not name the cities. LoCurto declined to give the cost of launching the system or the relative investments of Turner and ActMedia in the venture.

ActMedia, based in Darien, Conn., and a unit of Heritage Media Corp. of Dallas, Texas, was founded in 1973 and is the leader in in-store marketing programs.

The way the service is designed, it operates couponing and sampling programs and places advertising on shopping carts, aisle directories and store shelves in 20,000 supermarkets.
