"Florida and Texas are projected to have increases of more than 1 mil-lion jobs each," to 8 million and 9.7 million respectively, the department eaid.

The study projected that the finestes job growth will be in Nevada, up 31.5 percent to 847,000, and Arizona, up 26.7 percent to 2.3 million. Those two states also should show the fastest growth rates in total, personal income and population, the department said.

While Idaho's population growth is expected to run at a rate about midway among the 50 states, the expansion of employment opportunities in the state should be muchatoger and income, or a per capita basis, should increase at a rate bested by only three other states. That translates into more jobs at better money for a population that is expected to see less-than-average.

Poindexter's Iran-Contra role nets 6 months in jail

WASHINGTON — Former National Security Adviser John M. Poindexter was sentenced to six months in prison Monday by a judge who accused him of usurping the power of Congress by lying about the Iran-Contra affair.

The sentence imposed by U.S. District Judge Harold H. Greene was the first prison term for any of the seven people convicted as a result of the affair—Greene said leiting Poindexter off without a prison term "would be tantamount to a statement that a scheme to lie to and obstruct Congress is of no great-moment."

The judge delivered a stem lecture along with the sentence, saying Poindexter violated. "a principle, fundamental to this constitutional republic — that those elected by and responsible to the people shall make the important policy decisions."

Greene allowed Poindexter-to-emain free while he appeals five felony convictions of conspiracy, making false statements and obstruction.

Thesday/s geneduled meeting comes amid other new contacts between the Kremlin and Lithuania—the Baltic republic that has taken the boldest moves toward independence and has suffered most. Moscow's economic blockade against Lithuania enters its third month next week. The session between Gorbachev and the Baltic presidents could signal a new Kremlin diplomatic initiative to try to break the impasse over the republics' independence campaigns.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Classroom teachers want input on designing curriculums, selecting principals, choosing textbooks and spending school funds, according to a Gallup Poll released Monday.

"Teachers overwhelmingly want more say-ineverything," said Donna Rhodes, director of the National Foundation for the Improvement of Education, one of several groups that sponsored the

study.

The poll found that teachers believe they can make a difference in changing overall education policy and reforming the educational system on virtually all levels, if given the opportunity.



In 1984, 1 was a third-term member of Congress from Queens when Walter F. Mondale chose me to be his running mate. I never doubted my capabilities to be vice president. But I really wasn't prepared to deal with a national campaign, especially one of such historic interest.

I was not nationally known. I had no experience running for national office: I hadn't even un for statewide office. My family was quite sheltered, partly because of our strong ethnic tradition of privacy, partly because the press and public had little interest in my husband and children. And the agenda of the persons who would be making the decisions about my life and my family's was far broader than the future of Geraldine Ferraro.

Nor had running for Congress provided me with the kinds of experience that I could draw on it with the kinds of experience that I could draw on it with the first properties of the country of the country of the country of the country of the House of Representatives. I hired a staff of five and set out to make a name for myself. He criticized me for naving sent my children to private school. He coordinated the picketing of my home by Young Americans for Freedom, whose signs attacked my husband's business. He kept anti-abortion activists informed of my

appearances throughout the district.
We never got around to discussing the issues, but nobody noticed: The newspapers were ostrike. When I won the election, the Queens edition of one of the papers that had just resumed publishin headlined its story: "Geraldine,

Feinstein and the other women - mindidates today are experienced politicians with long, well-known records of public service. Before they announced, I'm sure they apent months debating with family-and friends the "whot if." of every aspect of the planned campaign. And once in the race, they no doubt spent hours honing their positions on the issues; trying them out in public and refining them with the press. These women are in control. They also share the advantage of lawing been exposed to the negative campaigning in the 1984 and 1988 presidential races. And they have learned from those experiences. As we saw in the Democratic primaries for governor in I Rasa and California, Tann Richards and Feinstein might be unwilling to in-Feinstein and the other womer

and California, Ann Richards and Feinstein might be unwilling to initiate a negative attack. But once attacked, they will not hesitate to respond quickly, and precisely.

Most Important, however, the Feinsteins are not saddled with the designation "woman candidate." They are candidates who happen to be women.

By this time next year, the press will be running stories about vari-ous governors and senators testing the waters for the 1992 presidential campaign. The question, of course, will be: Is it too soon for her to think about running?

When we have fewer women making history, we will have mo women making policy.

12 years long enough in Congress

WASHINGTON—The opinion polls suggest—
that the majority of the American public looks-favorably on the idea of limiting the terms of congressmen to a total of 12 years — two terms for
senators, six terms for members of the House.
Congressient, abviously, are much less enthusiastic about the idea. So, interestingly enough, are
most independent political scientists who can
claim some experise on the subject of Congress.
I myself have tended to defer to the opinion of
these knowledgeable political scientists. But
more recently I have become uneasy. Can it be
that the popular intuition, regardless of the simplemindodness with which it is expressed, is the
superior wisdom?

superior wisdom?

There are basically two arguments in favor of the status que. The first is that it makes no sense to deprive outselves of the services of congress men who, over a period of time, demonstrate great ability, achieve the respect of their peers well as of the media, and reveal exceptional skills at making the legislative process work effective-live.

The second argument hangs upon the ever-in-creasing complexity of congressional work, and the long period it takes for a member to gequire a proper expertise with regard, say, to the budget, or military expenditures, or Social Security, Even a first-class social scientist, with far more leisure of minary experiences, and a first-class social scientist, with far more leisure than a congressman has, cannot hope to master the intricacies of these matters in less than-three or four years. Does it make sense to entrust such programs to congressional committees dominated by newly elected novices?

Both arguments have considerable force, which is why so many intelligent and disinterested people are persuaded by them. But I have to say that, after spending the past three years in Washington and observing Congress at close hand. I no longer find them all that perstansive.

To begin with, there is the fact that a limitation on years in office would deprive us of the services not only of many good congressmen but

also of many who are less than good, as well as some who are positively awful. The ability to be-tre-elected again and again is not always.—alas!—an endorsement of congressional merit. We are all well aware, by now, of the immense advantages of incumbency that congressmen have quite deliberately acquired.

tages of incumbency that congressmen have quite deliberately acquired. If one were to make four lists of long-serving congressmen who are (a) good, (b) nondescript, (c) poor and (d) awful, where would the balance lie? I really do not know enough about all our coigressmen to compite such thist, but my strong-impression is that the (a) list would be very much in the minority.

It may be said, by way of rejoinder, that the (a)-list would consist of more influential congressmen than the others. Perhaps so—but is it not the case that their influence derives from being eleverand experienced enough-to-saiefy-the-views and appetites of the (b), (c), and (d) lists? If this is the case, as I auspect it is, then-their-presence is not—nearly-so crucial to good government as one might think. mearly so crucial to good government as one might think.

As for the time needed to achieve a mastery of

Às for the time necded to achieve a mastery or complex legislative issues – well, then the ques-tion arises: Why are they so complex? Need they be so complex? Is it not possible that yeteran con-gressmen; addressing such issues term after term; have an interest in making them so complex?

It would be perfectly natural if some such pro-cess were at work. And it would be naive to deny that it is at work. To be "master" of a complex isthat it is at work. To be "master" of a complex is-seu-is-to-be an every-strong position, vize-uvis lob-byists of all kinds, potential financial contribu-tors, and those "public interest" groups that have to learn to negotiate with you. It gives you power and prominence, whether at the national or re-gional or local level, that helps ensure your re-

clection.

It is my impression that the American people sense all this and are more than a fittle disgusted with it. They would like a Congress which, if more "amateurish," nevertheless had less of a stake in the existing system. Above all, they would like a Congress that is in "closer touch" with the American peoplo—and nothing can guarantee that more firmly than the certainty that after 12 years, a congressman would return to the "real world."

real world.

If that's the world he is going to inhabit, he is likely to regard it more respectfully and be less manipulative in his relations with it. Congress, today, is not in good repute with the American public, A 12-year limitation may be the price we have to pay for reviving its reputation. And, all in all, it may not be much of a price.

WASHINGTON (AP) — A governor's consent is not needed for the federal government to order state. National Guard teops to take part in peacetime training abroad, a unanimous Supreme Court said Monday.



"They were magnificent. If it was not for them I would not be here now," Lancaster said at Southampton General Hospital, where he was recovering from frostbite, broken bones and braitese.

He met privately for an hour with his rescuers — purser Nigel Ogden, steward Simon Rogers and stewardess Susan Prince — and posed with the trio, smiling and barchested in his hospital bed.

HAILEY - Faulty equipment and heavy nains conspired to overload the city's Riverside sewer plant, which dumped an undeternined amount of raw sewage into the Big Wood River late last month. "We believe solids have washed into the river," said Mike McMasters, water quality field supervisor with the state Division of Environmental Quality's Twin Falls office. The problems started with an inexperienced operator failing to notice that a power outage had caused sludge pumps to quit functioning. The pumps were out for two or

three days, allowing excess solids to build up in the plant's settling tanks.

Then a diversion pump that splits off some of the city's sewage to the city's Woodside plant failed. Without that pump, all the sewage flowed into the Riverside plant.

The failed pumps compounded the problem of excess flow from heavy rains. The
plant was unable to treat the water-coming
in fast enough to meet state and federal dis-

As a result, the plant exceeded discharge permit limits from May 24 to May 31.

Korean Air signs order for Boeing 747-400s

The contract includes spare parts and training and commits Korean Air to more of Boeing's most sophisticated and highest capacity jeilbors than any other carrier except Ispan Air Lines KAI. is buying 33, while IAI. has signed up for 40 of the world's largest passenger jets.

Frank Shrontz, Boeing-chalman and-chief excentive officer said at a new conference that the
large order reflects the fact that traffic growth in
the Placific has been higher than in 'either the
United States or Europe. The 747-400s, which
cach will be equipped to carry 392 passengers,
also are best suited to meet the long-range flights
and high-capacity needs of the region, Shrontz
said.

KAL Senior Executive Vice President C.H. Cho said during the news conference with Boeing that the airline also has contracts for delivery of eight other 747-400s by 1994 and already has tight other 747-400s by 1994 and already has three in service. KAL recently added long-range routes between Scoul and Moscow, Sydney, Toronto and Van-

Seoul and Moscow, Sydney, 1010m0 and vacuouver.

Cho said negotiations were under way to determine what engines the planes would use. He said

Korea produces some parts for the 747, but the purchase is not dependent upon continued use of Korean-made items for the planes.

Korean Ambassador Park Tong Jin said the purchase represented a "sincere effort to reduce" the country 6 trade surplus with the United States.

Boeing officials said 307 of the Seattle, Wash, company's 747-400s have been ordered, with 71 so far delivered to nirlines around the world.

The Korean order was the third largest ever re-ceived by Boeing and the third multibilition dollar-purchase of Boeing aircraft in as many weeks. The others also were from Asian air carriers: a \$2 billion order from the Chinese government and a \$3.1 billion order from Japan Air Lines.

"Boeing has received single orders for more planes, but only two exceed the Korean Air order in dollar value: an April 1989 order by Irish air-craft leasing company GPA Ltd. worth \$9.4 bil-lion for. 128.2 planes, and a \$7.11, billion deal for. 180 planes placed a week later by United Air-lines.

The 747-400 can fly more than 8,000 miles nonstop. The planes normally sell for \$116 million to \$136 million each, but officials said the Korean Air price reflects the estimated value of the dollar at the time of delivery, later this

Haynes claimed that it was "America's First Car," which it was not; Duryea and Oldsmobile. could have challenged that claim. Not that it matters now

In those inventive days hundreds of mechanics all over the world were building cars in sheds, and some of those handbuilt cars inspired their builders to organize companies to build cars and make fortunes for everybody. Of the thousands of makes actually built and sold, only a few have survived.

Soveral-European-car-makershad been selling cars for years before Elwood Haynes asked the Apperson brothers in 1894 to build an experimental car for him using a motorboat engine.

He probably knew he was not the "first" anywhere, but that did not stop him from placing on the radiator of every Haynes car a nameplate with a picture of the-little experimental car and the motto "America's First Car" beneath the picture.

A few Haynes-Apperson cars were built in the Apperson shop in


Kokomo, Ind., and in 1898 the first production cars were sold.

Elmer and Edgar Apperson did not get along very well with Elwood Haynes, so they left him in 1902 and started to build. Apperson cars.

In "1913- Haynes tried an electrically controlled gear shifting device with push buttons, but it did not work very well and was soon discarded. Like

cylinders should mean more sales, so a twelve cylinder car was announced in 1919.

Plan a gasoline budget this summer

PHILADELPHIA — Motorists expecting a reversal of last summer's high gasoline prices could be in for a surprise.

Despite a drop in the cost of crude oil and the absence of a major disaster like last year's oil spill in Alaska, April retail gasoline prices at the national level were keeping pace with those of April 1989. Many observers expect prices to climb. by the peak summer driving period, starting in July.

"We could see gasoline prices move-up-7-to-9-cents a gallon from where they are," said Dennis Eklof, economist with Cambridge Energy Research Associates in Massachusetts.

Last year, many motorists shortened or canceled vacations as gas prices surged after the Alaska spill. Between Easter and Memorial Day in 1989, prices spurted 17 cents a gallon, according to the American Automobile Association.

But, since the increase was based on expectations of gasoline shortages rather than actual shortages, prices dropped by summer, although they still were higher than during the summer of 1988. Barring any serious supply problems this year, a similar price increase is unlikely, observers say.

Statistics released May 16 by the Bureau of Labor Statistics in Washington show that at the national level, prices have remained firm amid a weakening in crude oil prices from \$24.20

per 42-gallon barrel on Jan. 22 to 1990, analysts generally cite two \$16.25 on April 11.

Those rates were spot prices on e New York Mercantile Exchange. Average prices for all grades of gasoline nationallyedged up to \$1.096 in April from \$1.09 in January, according to the

Bureau of Labor Statistics. "What we're expecting is that prices in the summer months ... will be in the range of \$1.10 to \$1.16 a gallon on average," said Cal Kilgore, director of the Office of Energy Markets for the Department of Energy.

Last year, average prices spring mappeaked at \$1.152 after the March refineries, the nation's worst oil spill and briefly shut oil-supply terminals in

O. As a teacher, I read your column on "saying no to kids" with great interest. The same thing that happens to parents happens to teachers. If someone doesn't have their math homework done and I say they can't go out for lunch recess until it's finished, the child is likely to say, "Well, if I do half of it, can I go out for half of the recess? I agree with you that many parents rather avoid the confrontation of saying no than to take time to stick to their rules and explain their reasoning. But it scares me when I see kids continually trying to bend every rule in the book. What can we do,

if anything, about this? - A.M. A. Many teachers share you concern. That's why this issue should be discussed and addressed at staff and parents

Many parents today don't have the support of extended families. Today, care givers and teachers often need to fill in for those missing relatives. Grandmas and grandpas would remind parents that their kids will grow up to be adults, and adults have to follow rules about driving, paying taxes and keeping jobs. They would

remind them that children today may look and talk like adults, but they're still children

I'm not sure if kids today are smarter that we were, but most of them do have bigger vocabularies and better communication skills than we had at corresponding ages. This is not surprising, considering that these kids have grown up during an explosion of communication technology.

I agree that it's scary to see children try, and often succeed, in bending the rules to their own advantage. If we give in when we shouldn't, just to avoid the hassle. or save time, we may be adding to the problem of an increasingly exploitive society in which more and more individuals believe it is OK to bend or break the rules as long as they get what they want and get away with it.







Add a few fish to your aquarium

How should you add fish to an aquarium? If the aquarium is new, and there are no other fish in it. then you can transfer the fish directly into the tank.

For at least 30 minutes, float the plastic bag containing the fish in the tank to equalize temperatures. Then, open the bag and slowly scoop water from the tank into the bag to minimize the shock to the fish from the different water. Gently tip the bag and release the

If you already have fish in the aquarium, don't-add-new-fish-right away. First, isolate the new fish for at least a week in a small quarantine tank. Set the temperature to 77 degrees Fahrenheit.

The new fish should be checked daily for any sign of disease, particularly parasites, newcomers are placed with the

other fish

When you do add the new fish to the established aquarium, simultaneously feed the fish that already are in the tank, This will distract them from attacking the new fish

Fish-tank problems have a number of sources: overcrowding, excess heat, tight-fitting tank lids -that-restrict oxygen, overfeeding, poor water conditions and unsanitary conditions,

The bane of fish health is a thick sediment called mulm that settles on the floor of the tank. It is made up of fish feces, uneaten food, decaying plant material and microorganisms, and it is a breeding-place-for-harmful-

To control mulm, be sure that filters and aerators are functioning properly and replace filters on which must be treated before the schedule. Consult the fish dealer about adding a "biological" or

subgravel filter, which is effective

in dealing with mulm. Overfeeding is a common cause of unhealthy fish. Fish expert Brian Ward writes that "very few fish die from starvation; underfeeding normally only slows

their growth. Overfeeding causes ill-health and bloating, while the decay of excess food can cause a sudden and catastrophic collapse of the aquanum ecology, killing all the fish in a few hours.

He recommends giving fish only as much food as they can consume within five minutes

Thanks to enterprising plantsmen who have turned the queen of fall flowers" into a year-round floral asset, mums are found at any time in florist shops. supermarts and wherever plants

are sold. Indeed, you will find blooming specimens now right alongside. the array of petunias, impatiens and other flowers offered for spring planting by bedding plant

Chances are, however, that your own yard is a good source for new plants to extend your 1990 mum beds and borders if you grew them last year. By now, these established plants afready are showing strong growth and need only a little reworking to assure a bountiful new round of blooms.

DIVIDE AND REPLANT

You will be surprised at how many new plants can be started from these burgeoning green clumps by simply dividing and replanting them. To do this: Lift moss. the old clumps with a sharp spading fork, digging far enough away from the clumps to avoid injuring the shoots.

Carefully pull apart the rooted stems from around the outside of each clump and replant each as a separate plant. Even if the shoots Gardening

CHICAGO - Colorful mums are small, they will grow quickly, with each rooted stem developing into a full-sized, well-budded plant, Discard the tough, woody centers of the clumps. Encourage strong, compact growth for abundant fall blooms by keeping the young plants watered well, fertilizing occasionally and pinching" them periodically.

"Pinching" simply means removing the tender growing tips of stems with your fingertips each new growth. The cutoff time for this is around mid-July, when the plants begin forming flower buds and should be allowed to grow freely. By this time, you may have pinched them back two or

Since mums transplant so easily, many gardeners prefer to row them in rows by themselves through the summer in an out-ofthe-way place, perhaps even in the vegetable plot, until they are ready to be moved to flower beds, planter boxes or wherever they are desired for autumn color. They can be moved safely even when in flower.

Another way to propagate new plants is to take 4- to 5-inch cuttings of new growth from old clumps and then root them in a mixture of sharp sand and peat

Merely insert the stems up to lower leaves on the cuttings and keep the mixture moist. Roots should develop in two to three weeks

Meanwhile, the already flowering mums purchased in pots this spring can perform

nurtured in greenhouses for a token of springtime blooms, with the promise of mounds of fresh blooms again in autumn. They are ideal for bolstering the mum collection with new colors and

INSTANT COLOR

Enjoy them temporarily as not plants, if you choose, or plant them in the garden for "instant" spring color. When the initial blooms fade, cut the plants back several inches, then pinch them as described and by autumn they will have more blooms than they did

in spring. Generous use of mums can erente spectacular vistas because they flower when blooms of most annuals and other perennials are languishing. Their colors include vibrant reds, yellows, pinks, whites, smoky lavenders, bronzes and many bicolors. They also boast many diverse and interesting forms, including the button; the daisy-flowered; the spider, with its long, arching petals; and the large, decorative varieties.

Although planted mostly for snowy borders, individual clumps of mums will create dramatic accents among other plants. They are also striking in containers on a patio, porch or apartment balcony. The natural mounding form of some varieties is especially effective in containers.

Full sunlight and soil that drains well-provide the most-favorable growing conditions. Ample watering, particularly during dry spells, is essential because the plants have shallow roots. Given reasonable care, mums will provide many seasons of bloom.
