Bush, 3 ex-presidents join in historic dedication of Nixon Library

VORBA LINDA, Calif. (AP) — Richard Nixon, a political outcast no more, basked Thursday in the praise of three other men who held America's highest office during a ceremony where the word Watergate was mentioned only once.

That mention, almost in passing, came from George Bush.

The president, former presidents Gerald Ford and Ronald Reagan, along with their wives, joined to give the new Nixon Library and Birthplace a festive send-off. It was an occasion as red, white and blue as the thousands of balloons that were released at the end of the 2 1/2-hour ceremony.

Never before have four presidents of the United States shared the same platform. Jimmy Carter, the fifth living president, sent his regrets.

Bush said that visitors for years to come will learn of Nixon's six crises — the title of his first book — "and the seventh crisis, Watergate."

None of the other speakers mentioned the scandal that drove Nixon from office in 1974.

For Nixon, it was a major milestone in his relentless drive for acceptance. "This is a very special day for all of us," he told a crowd of more than 10,000. "Nothing we have ever seen matches this moment, to be wel-

only in recent years has been invited to their functions.

Bush led the tributes to the 37th president. "To occupy this office is to feel a kinship with these and other presidents," he said. "Each of whom, in

his own way, sought to do right and thus achieve good. ... Each wondered, I suspect, how they could be worthy of God, and man."

Bush, who as chairman of the Republican Party in 1974 urged Nixon

to resign, urged visitors to the \$21 million library to "look at Richard Nixon the man."

Nixon, said Bush, "was the quintessence of Middle America" who touched a cord with millions of citizens.

"He loved America's good, quiet, decent people; he spoke for them; he felt deeply, on their behalf."

Ford, who served out Nixon's term, began his speech with "Mr. President, Mr. President, Mr. President. If I overlooked a president, will he please stand up."

He told Nixon, "This day is a celebration richly deserved by you and by Fat."

Rengan said, "the world is a better place, a safer place, because of Richard Nixon."

The library, adjacent to the 900-square-foot house where Nixon was born 77 years ago, tells the story of Nixon's life, from his boyhood through the political offices he held — congressman, senator, vice president and president. The exhibits also include a treatment of Watergate, the scandal that was Nixon's undoing.

The audience in 90-degree heat outdoors was said by library spokesman Fred Gorell to number 40,000. Police, however, estimated the crowd at 10,000-plus.

Most of the crowd was on the suburban streets surrounding the spacious library grounds 25 miles southeast of downtown Los Angeles. Within the building, there were 2,400 seats for invited visitors and bleacher space for 1,400.

Many stalwarts from the Nixon administration showed up. Former Vice President Spiro T. Agnew and William Rogers were in the audience, as was Alexander Haig, Nixon's chief of staff in the final year, and William Simon, Nixon's secretary of the treasury.

Some protesters showed up and two were ejected. Outside on Yorba Linda Boulevard, people waved signs saying "He's still Tricky Dick," and "Richard Repent."

Evangelist Billy Graham, an old Nixon friend and frequent guest in the Nixon White House, spoke in his opening prayer of "the upheavals and uncertainties through which the world passed" during the Nixon era.

Before the ceremony, in the cool of the library, Nixon was asked how he felt.

"I feel as good as the rest of them look," Nixon said pointing to his fellow presidents.

Nixon toured the library Wednesday for the first time and was asked how he liked it.

House restores funds to fight drugs

WASHINGTON — The House on Thursday restored a proposed \$231 million cut in the administration's drug programs, but Democrats and Republicans denounced drug policy director William J. Bennett for his job that prompted the change.

"Bill Bennett has lost his effectiveness with the Congress," said Rep. Charles Rangel, D-N.Y., chairman of the House select committee on narcotics. "The fact that he has now seen fit to insult the Congress rather than consult the Congress is unfortunate."

Funding for Bennett's programs was included in the \$170 billion appropriations bill for the departments of Labor, Health and Human Services and Education.

Proposal to sell organs raises outcry

MILWAUKEE — A proposal to sell the organs of dead welfare recipients has prompted such outrage that some people fear it will undermine other plans to solve a serious organ donor crisis.

Milwaukee County Board Supervisor T. Anthony Zielinski made the proposal in an effort to reduce the county's burial expenses. But a flood of criticism persuaded him to drop the plan, and it now has no chance of passage.

Still, some observers are worried that the political backlash from Zielinski's plan will doom other proposals to help relieve donor organ shortages. One such proposal would have allowed welfare recipients to sign forms permitting the county to donate their organs after death.

Bills would spread S&L bailout costs

WASHINGTON — Wealthy Americans and Texans would bear a greater burden of the savings and loan bailout under separate bills filed in Congress Thursday.

Rep. Joseph P. Kennedy II, D-Mass., argued that wealthy investors used federal protection for up to \$100,000 in deposits to reap substantial interest income. Now that scores of S&Ls have gone under, poor and middle class taxpayers are unfairly being asked to pay, he said. Kennedy proposed legislation that would raise \$100 million in bailout costs over five years by imposing three new taxes: a 7.5 percent surtax on interest, dividends and capital gains for those with income more than \$100,000 per year; a 5 percent surtax on corporations earning more than \$75,000 per year.

Western states' personal income shows greatest jump

WASHINGTON (AP) — Personal incomes are growing fastest in Western states and slowest in New England, the government said Thursday in a report indicating the 1980s phenomenon of the bi-coastal economy is ending.

Eight of the 11 states with fastest income growth between the first quarter of 1989 and the January-March period of this year are located in the West, the Commerce Department said.

The eight had growth rates ranging from Nevada's 12.2 percent, the

fastest in the United States, to Oregon and California's 8.2 percent. That compares with a national average over the period of 6.9 percent.

Income growth rates in other states in the top 11 include: Hawaii, 9.9 percent; Alaska, 9.8 percent; Washington, 9.6 percent; Idaho, 9.2 percent; Kansas, 8.9 percent, and Utah, Florida and Minnesota, 8.4 percent.

Income growth in New England states, by comparison, was lackluster, ranging from 3.6 percent in New Hampshire to a near-average 6.8

percent in Connecticut. Economists who follow regional patterns said Thursday's report provided evidence that the bi-coastal economy of the 1980s, in which California and the Northeast enjoyed more prosperity than the nation's heartland, is over.

"We are returning to an economic pattern that we saw 15 to 20 years ago," said economist Robert Dye of The West Group, a Bala Cynwyd, Pa., forecasting firm.

Growth has shifted to the Sunbelt states of the West and South and

away from the Snow Belt states of the North, he said.

The states with the slowest income growth, in addition to New Hampshire, were: North Dakota, 2.3 percent; South Dakota, 3 percent; Montana, 4 percent; Indiana and Maine, 4.4 percent; Massachusetts, 4.6 percent; West Virginia, 4.9 percent and Rhode Island, 5 percent.

By region, incomes in the Far West grew 8.5 percent; Southeast, 7.2 percent; Rocky Mountain states, 7.1 percent; Southwest and Mid-Atlantic states, 7 percent; Plains states,

6.8 percent; Great Lakes states, 5.5 percent and New England, 5.2 percent.

Economist Mark Zandi of Regional Financial Associates, a West Chester, Pa., consulting firm, said a booming casino industry and related construction are keeping Nevada growing.

Strong lumber exports, a flood of orders for civilian aircraft to Boeing Co. and heavy migration of Californians looking for a more affordable place to live are fueling growth in the Northwest, he said.

Defense chief has hard time finding a threat

WASHINGTON — It's a tough time to be running the Pentagon, Defense Secretary Dick Cheney confided over breakfast Thursday, as he rattled off potential threats to American interests around the globe as the once-invincible Soviet threat continues to decline.

"I'm not just a defense secretary looking for a threat," he stressed, before explaining how hard it has been to keep Moscow at the top of the Defense Department's enemies list.

"I sat down two or three weeks ago to lay out a number of indicators — things I would take as hard evidence that the Soviets are, in fact, fundamentally transforming themselves," said Cheney, a hardline conservative.

Well-supplied Khmer Rouge invade large areas inside Cambodia

SIEM REAP PROVINCE, Cambodia (AP) — Khmer Rouge guerrillas have seized large areas deep inside Cambodia in recent months and say they will fight as long as needed

if they are shut out of a political settlement. A recent five-week, 450-mile trip through the country's north by this reporter found the Khmer Rouge

have strong Chinese support and have stockpiled caches of weapons, ammunition and funds in case foreign aid is cut. The United States announced

Wednesday it was withdrawing recognition of the guerrilla coalition dominated by the Communist Khmer Rouge. The coalition also includes the non-Communist forces of Prince Norodom Sihanouk and Son Sann.

The U.S. move was prompted by fears of a return to power of the Khmer Rouge. The Communist group killed hundreds of thousands of people in forced agrarian reform in the 1970s until Vietnam invaded and installed a new government in early 1979.

The 30,000-man Khmer Rouge army already controls hundreds of villages in the country's south, west and north, and it operates in virtually all parts of the country.

In their jungle command posts, senior Khmer Rouge commanders said recently they were stepping up the fight to force the Vietnamese-backed government into political concessions.

"The Khmer Rouge have everything they want from China. They

don't need any more guns or money," said Col. Khan Savoun, a commander of Sihanouk's army.

"U.S. support for the non-Communists is very important psychologically for the non-Communist resistance. But it means nothing for the Khmer Rouge."

Ta Pok, a Khmer Rouge brigade commander in this northwestern province, said he listened to the Voice of America and Radio Free Asia for news on peace and hoped for progress. But he said the guerrillas cannot wait around for documents to be signed.

"The Vietnamese will only listen to strength, and if they don't listen they will lose everything," Ta Pok said. "Our strategy is to isolate Kompong Speu, Battambang and Kompong Thom. But we already have most of Kompong Speu and Kompong Thom. We are doing very, very well."

The guerrillas have seized large quantities of weapons in recent fighting. Dozens of hidden jungle

bases are full of ammunition and captured heavy weapons were seen in the north.

The Chinese aid is channeled through the Thai border. But as the guerrillas push deeper into the country, they rely on the hidden caches and food from recently seized villages.

Thousands of soldiers and civilian supporters were seen moving freely through newly seized areas.

Heavy fighting between Khmer Rouge and government troops held up at several key forward outposts defending Siem Reap city was heard every day. The guerrillas mined roads, attacked supply convoys and overran government artillery bases.

"We are winning more easily than we expected. There is nothing that can stop us," said Khmer Rouge division commander Mit Lot, in charge of areas around the ancient temples of Angkor Wat in Siem Reap province.

Bus accident kills 1, injures many students

OXFORD, England (AP) — A double-decker bus carrying 58 American teen-agers at Oxford University overturned on a highway Thursday, killing at least one person and seriously injuring 32, police said.

Twenty-four others suffered lesser injuries, they said.

"I saw a lot of people running about. There were bodies everywhere and I went to help," said one witness, John Welch. "I got one chap out and saw another girl badly cut her head and I helped to get her out."

The American students, all about 16 years old, were taking a summer school course at the university's Magdalen College, said Thames Valley Police spokesman Anne Jackson. None of the victims was immediately named.

The Oxford Advanced Studies Program in New York organized the summer school course for gifted students from all over the United States, U.S. Coordinator Paul Beresford-Hill said by telephone from New York. He said most were between their junior and senior years in high school.

The 32 seriously hurt were rushed on stretchers to the John Radcliffe Hospital in Oxford, Jackson said.

Italy may permit women in military

ROME (AP) — Women could volunteer for service in the Italian military, one of the last all-male armed forces in Europe, under legislation approved by a parliamentary committee.

The bill passed Wednesday by the Defense Committee of the Senate also would reduce the draft for men from 12 months to 10 months and offer alternative service in such fields as civil defense and environmental protection.

Increasing numbers of Italian women have been joining the police forces in recent years, but the armed forces have remained closed to them. Elsewhere in Europe, women have joined the military in many countries.

Ousted Chinese reformer rumored to be reinstated

BEIJING (AP) — Media reports from Hong Kong and Washington that ousted Communist Party leader Zhao Ziyang is being rehabilitated drew flustered claims of ignorance Thursday from a Foreign Ministry spokesman.

"I haven't seen such a report," Jin Guihua said at the ministry's weekly news conference. "I advise you not to believe this kind of rumors too easily."

After the news conference, worried he might be misunderstood, the normally unflappable Jin told reporters in flustered English: "I must say that, the conditions of Zhao Ziyang, I don't know. I don't know. His present status, I don't know, so don't misquote me."

"What I want to advise you, there are so many rumors. The honest advice I give you is not to believe. There are too many rumors. Rumors are rampant. Be careful. That's all."

Jin refused to deny the reports outright. However, the official Xinhua News Agency later quoted an unidentified Foreign Ministry official as saying the reports were "a groundless rumor" and that Zhao was still being investigated. Jin made no such statement at the news conference.

The Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post quoted an unidentified U.S. official as saying senior leader Deng Xiaoping was planning to send Zhao on an inspection mission throughout China.

Voters deserve a chance to decide local sales tax

Our guess is, most folk around here would vote no if they were asked to raise their sales tax by a penny. But who's to say they shouldn't have the opportunity?

Idaho cities are rehashing an idea they've had in their legislative fridge for more than a decade: a local-option sales tax. The proposal, if approved by the Legislature, would let cities and counties ask voters for an extra penny of sales tax.

Among the officials backing the idea are city leaders in Twin Falls. City Manager Tom Courtney says rising demands and declining revenue are putting the city in an ever-tightening squeeze.

That extra penny would let the city pay for services that citizens want, while cutting property taxes, Courtney says. Next winter, he and other officials of Idaho cities will ask the Legislature once again to authorize the local option.

We're not sure an additional sales tax would be the wonder drug that the cities hope for. It has some serious drawbacks.

One, it would create a patchwork of uneven tax rates across the state. Some areas would have it while others didn't — a fact that wouldn't escape budget-conscious consumers.

You can bet retailers of any given town would howl about giving a 1 percent competitive advantage to their competitors in the next town.

Retailers near the Oregon border — al-

ready handicapped by the state sales tax — would be especially hostile to the idea.

And taxpayers themselves aren't likely to be enthusiastic. Sales taxes are painfully visible — we all get a reminder of them whenever we spend money.

In Twin Falls, the next year or so might be an especially tough time to sell a new tax. Local voters soon will be asked to approve money for an expanded emergency 911 system and for a major school construction project. And a federal tax hike may be on the way, if we're reading the president's lips accurately.

Despite all those doubts, the local option idea has some merit.

A local sales tax spreads the tax burden to all consumers. In contrast with property taxes, which lean heavily on large property owners, it would come closer to spreading the load among all of those being served.

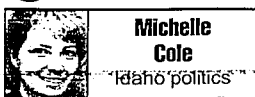
True, sales taxes are naturally somewhat regressive. But a penny-on-the-dollar tax for direct local services is not burdensome.

The best thing about the local option is that local taxpayers would control it. That fact, by itself, is enough reason for legislators to give serious consideration to the cities' proposal next year.

Anything that moves taxing authority from the Statehouse to the voting booth is at least worth a look.

Why I didn't go to see the President

When the Larry Craig for Senate camp broke the news a month ago that President Bush would come to Idaho to stump for his candidate, I began to think about what I would ask the leader of the free world.

Only one Idaho radio reporter would be allowed and only one Idaho television camera.

Are you going to renege on your promise to leave the sugar program untouched? Is building the New Production Reactor at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory essential for national security? Don't you and Congressman Craig disagree on remedies for the budget deficit?

As it turned out, when Bush went to Boise Thursday, I didn't. I thought readers might like to know why.

On Wednesday I learned that only three or four Idaho reporters would get close enough to the president to talk with him. I wasn't one of them.

Earlier in the week, the White House advance team had scheduled the president's time minute by minute, from 4:15 p.m., when Air Force One was to land at Gowen Field, to 6:05, when the president would leave Boise City Hall for the Boise Convention Center, to 7:35, when Air Force One would take off again.

It was clear that my only chance to ask Bush about Idaho issues might be at a late-afternoon roundtable discussion with Boise Mayor Dirk Kempthorne's drug task force.

But the White House advance team had other plans.

Because of the small room at City Hall, I was told only "expanded pool coverage" would be allowed into the roundtable discussion. The meeting would be closed to *The Times-News* and to every other Idaho newspaper — except for *The Statesman* and

from having to respond to embarrassing or touchy issues."

Instead of a discussion of farm trade policy, the only thing Idahoans are likely to remember about the president's visit is that Larry Craig was at his side.

David Fish, Craig's press secretary, said the Craig campaign wasn't to blame.

"They set the pools," he said. "They would only allow us one from each media."

But Fish urged me to come to Boise anyway. After all, I could be there to hear the president's scheduled 10-minute address to those attending a \$100-a-plate dinner.

I wasn't the only Idaho reporter to decline the invitation.

"In general the staff that arranges the visit is rude to anyone not working for the *New York Times* or the *Washington Post*," said Dean Miller, a former *Times-News* reporter who covers Idaho politics for Spokane's *Spokesman-Review*. "For Idaho reporters it's just a waste of time."

Although Idaho reporters are complaining, it's the Idaho public that should feel jilted. If they didn't buy a ticket to Craig's fund-raising dinner or pay \$1,000 to have their picture taken with the president, their only chance at seeing Bush was during his trip from the airstrip to downtown.

First reports were that the president's car would stop so that Bush could shake hands with the crowd. The White House advance staff quickly squashed those rumors.

A Bush aide did promise, however, that the president's car would slow down.

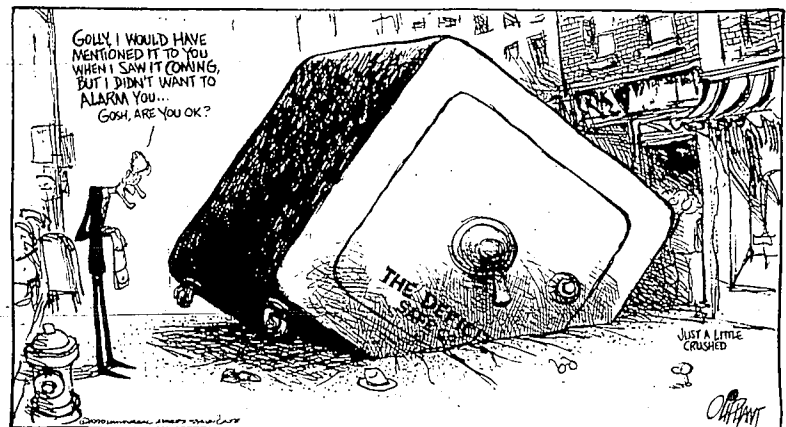

Bush finally facing crisis in his term as president

It seems fitting that President Bush spoke at the dedication of Richard Nixon's presidential library this week.

Not only was Bush, in his days as Republican national chairman, one of the former president's chief defenders, but the appearance comes as Bush is entering the most protracted crisis of his administration. And it was Nixon who wrote the book about the significance of how one deals with crises.

Bush is not facing anything like the difficulties that enveloped Nixon during and following his 1972 re-election campaign.

But a combination of the savings and loan situation and the personal involvement of his son Neil have finally dimmed the extraordinary aura that has enveloped the president since he took office.

Their impact has been exacerbated because they come against a backdrop of an economy that appears to be running out of steam. Evidence of a slowdown ranges from the reduced growth rate estimates in Monday's mid-year federal budget review to the analyses showing a third of the states in recession.

The interrelationship of these events is threatening the most crucial elements in the extraordinary Republican success of the last decade — the record period of economic recovery after the severe 1981-82 recession and the GOP's stand against higher taxes.

The soaring cost of S&L bail-out is putting a strain on the federal budget while the slowdown is costing it revenue.

That increases the pressure for a massive federal deficit reduction package at a time when most congressional and administration leaders don't think they can save enough by cutting spending.

And it means trying to find additional revenue at a time when many experts fear that any kind of a significant tax increase could tip the economy into an all-out recession.

That is a scenario that critics of the Reagan and Bush administrations have long predicted.

The unexpected factor is the way the Neil Bush situation has enabled Democrats to focus their criticism.

It hardly helps that the president's son is not now facing any charges of criminal wrongdoing but rather is accused of using his position as the director of a savings and loan institution to help gain favorable treatment for business friends.

The crux of the argument that many Democrats have made for several years is that wealthy Americans have benefited at the expense of others from such Reagan-Bush economic policies as tax cuts and deregulation.

And Neil Bush, as evidenced by the zest with which top Democrats have pounced, is a perfect political symbol for that case.

This puts the president in a difficult position, as he recognizes.

"This is not easy for me as a father," he said last week. "It's easy for me as a president because the system is going to work. I will not intervene."

Bush has managed to handle this matter quite deftly by displaying both parental concern and official dispassion. But some associates are already sufficiently concerned that they sought to pressure Neil into abandoning efforts to fight the case.

In the months ahead, pressures on the president are likely to grow.

And how Bush handles those pressures in a personal search may be as important as what he does.

But he will help himself if he remembers that Nixon's view of a political world filled with enemies, in the end, helped to bring him down.

On the day he left office in 1974, Nixon gave a long, rambling, emotional speech to family, friends and aides. "Always remember," he said, "others may hate you, but those who hate you don't win unless you hate them, and then you destroy yourself."

Quake deaths at 490

BAGUIO, Philippines (AP) — The death toll from a devastating earthquake rose to nearly 500 Thursday, and officials raised fears hundreds more may have perished in landslides in remote northern mountains.

Rescuers abandoned the search for more survivors in the rubble of a school in Cabaganan and in one of eight hotels that collapsed in the mountain resort of Baguio during Monday's quake.

According to figures compiled by the Office of Civil Defense and the Red Cross, at least 490 people died and nearly 1,100 were injured in the tremor, which measured 7.7 on the Richter scale.

At least 138 people were killed in Baguio, including two Americans. About 250 people were believed buried in ruins of seven other hotels and in a factory in Baguio that caught fire after the quake. Rescuers feared most were dead.

Defense Secretary Fidel Ramos said there were indications that more deaths may have occurred in the northern province of Nueva Vizcaya than the 27 so far reported.

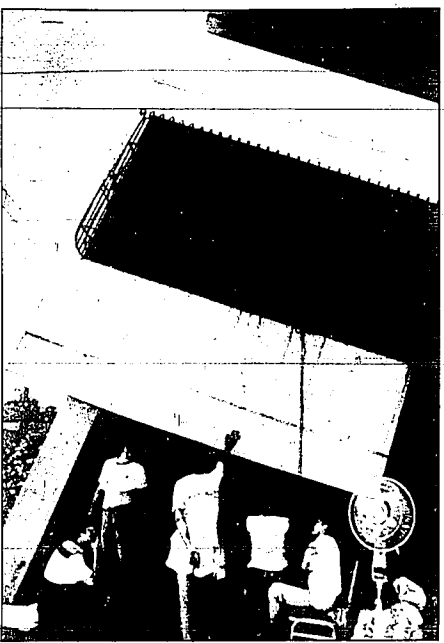
He said about 900 motorists were believed stranded by landslides along the national highway along the border between Nueva Ecija and Nueva Vizcaya province about 100 miles north of Manila.

The Philippine air force planned air missions Friday to rescue about 100 motorists believed stranded along a highway near Baguio, 110 miles north of Manila.

As many as 30,000 people fled on foot from Baguio resort for the lowlands along a highway blocked by landslides, an official said.

Scores of people crowded aboard military aircraft which were flying relief supplies. The U.S. military, also flew about 250 Americans from Baguio to Clark Air Base.

Liberian rebels launch major attack near center of capital

MONROVIA, Liberia (AP) — Rebels on Thursday launched what appeared to be a major offensive about three miles from the center of the capital, witnesses said.

Under increasing pressure from Iraq over oil quotas, Kuwait looks for help

MANAMA, Bahrain (AP) — Tiny Kuwait appealed to its Arab neighbors for help Thursday in the face of a barrage of threats from an increasingly belligerent Iraq.

In Baghdad, Iraq's President Saddam Hussein tightened his already iron grip on power, winning support from his rubber-stamp parliament for a presidency for life.

The developments underscored simmering tensions in the Persian Gulf, long a flashpoint for Mideast quarrels. The region includes about two-thirds of the world's proven oil reserves, so instability can pose a threat to the world's oil supply.

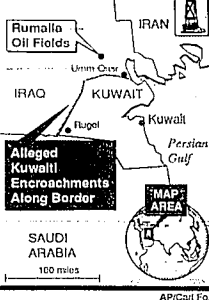
Oil has been the fuel for Iraq's quarrel with Kuwait. Baghdad in recent days denounced Kuwait and the United Arab Emirates for exceeding production quotas set by the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries.

Iraq says falling oil prices brought on by the oil glut have robbed it of \$14 billion in revenues in the past year, and Saddam this week accused quota violators of stabbing Iraq in the back "with a poisoned dagger."

Kuwait sought to defuse the dispute on Thursday.

It solicited Arab League help in settling its longstanding border dispute with Iraq. It enlisted the help of influential Saudi Arabia in easing

Iraq Accuses Kuwait of Stealing Oil



Saudi responses has been fears that the quarrel could disrupt an OPEC price — which had slipped to \$14 a barrel recently — have recovered to around OPEC's benchmark level of \$18 a barrel.

Some Kuwaiti officials and diplomats suggested that Saddam's accusations are aimed at winning a write-off of a debt of \$30 billion to Kuwait and Saudi Arabia. The two poured the money into Iraq during the 1980-88 war against Iran to prop up its economy and pay for weapons.

Kuwait's appeal for help in settling the border dispute was made in a memorandum sent to the Arab League headquarters in Tunis. The Kuwait News Agency quoted the memo as suggesting that a committee be formed to resolve the question "on the basis of treaties and existing documents."

By this week accused Kuwait of border incursions including the pumping of \$2.4 billion worth of oil in the past decade from an Iraqi oil field near the boundary.

Yeltsin cuts off official perks

MOSCOW (AP) — Russian federation president Boris N. Yeltsin, who won popular support by denouncing the privileges enjoyed by the ruling elite, has abolished those luxuries for the republic's officials, Tass reported Thursday.

The decree did not appear to apply to high-ranking officials of the national government and Communist Party who live in Moscow, which is both the capital of the Soviet Union and the Russian federation, the largest of the 15 Soviet republics.

The decree that was signed by Yeltsin abolished all kinds and forms of privileges to officials in the Russian federation as of Aug. 1, saying they "violate social justice," the news agency reported.

Abolished were privileges "on power, on unearned payments, on undeserved benefits, (and) on undeserved and unearned comfortable working and living conditions."

Legislation introduced to ratify water pact

WASHINGTON (AP) — Legislation ratifying the recently negotiated agreement on water rights for the Fort Hall Indian Reservation has been introduced in both houses of Congress.

The bills, offered by the members of the Idaho's congressional delegation on Wednesday with the support of the Bush administration, culminate five years of negotiation between state and federal officials, private water users and leaders of the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes in eastern Idaho.

"Instead of seeking federal dollars

to develop new water storage projects, they have allocated the available water supply in a way that ensures, to the extent possible, that the needs of each party are met," McClure said.

"This agreement provides a process for the delivery of water to Indian and non-Indian alike."

The settlement, part of the historic water rights adjudication of the entire Snake River Basin, entitles the tribes to 581,000 acre-feet of water each year with a provision that during low water years the reservation will tap storage water so non-Indian

users can continue to draw from the natural flow of the Blackfoot River.

The bill includes provisions to ensure tribal water rights do not adversely affect historic non-Indian water uses in the area, and to mitigate the impact of the Shoshone-Bannock claim to 115,000 acre-feet of water from the Snake River, the government will make nearly 100,000 acre-feet of storage water available for non-Indian use.

Also on Wednesday, a Senate subcommittee earmarked \$500,000 to continue flood-control work on the Deep Creek reach of the Salmon

River near the city of Salmon.

That action keeps alive the pilot project to eliminate winter ice build up on the river that has caused severe flooding in the city in the past, resulting in millions of dollars of damage.

Because that reach of the river is protected, traditional methods cannot be used, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has been testing screens to keep the ice from building. The project got a late start in 1989 when it was first authorized, and no progress was made last winter because of mild conditions.

INEL subcontractor found to have contaminated equipment

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — A government check has found six items contaminated with radioactivity at the Idaho Falls shop of a subcontractor at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

"We're conducting a historical investigation to try to determine how the contamination occurred," INEL

spokesman Brad Bugger said. "Right now, we're not sure how it happened."

Bugger declined to identify the subcontractor except to say he works on a project basis for MK-Ferguson, the construction contractor at the INEL.

The government check was or-

dered after the subcontractor brought a core drilling bit into the Idaho Chemical Processing Plant at the site on July 13. The bit set off a portal radiation monitor and fixed contamination on the bit was measured at 3,000 counts per minute.

The subcontractor said he had last used the bit and some other contam-

inated items at the INEL in 1986.

The contaminated items, tools and fittings, emitted from 100 to 10,000 counts per minute of beta-gamma radiation and posed no health risk to the public, officials said. They said the mantles of many common camping lanterns emit about 15,000 counts per minute.

2 key U of I employees stay for big pay hikes

MOSCOW (AP) — The chairman of the University of Idaho's English department is getting a 36 percent pay hike and a history professor is receiving a 25 percent raise to stay put.

They are among 95 faculty and administrative staff whose salaries are increasing by at least 10 percent in this fiscal year. The salaries of eight of those people will jump by at least 20 percent.

None of Idaho's vice presidents nor deans will see raises above 9 percent in this fiscal year.

This spring, legislators granted the state's four-year schools 5.3 percent more money for raises based on merit, longevity and promotions, and 1.2 percent more money to bring the salaries of faculty members closer to those

of their peers.

Idaho President Elisabeth Zinser increased the salary equity pool to 1.5 percent more money and dropped the merit, longevity and promotion pool to 5 percent more money to make dents in the salary equity problems of key faculty members.

Gary Williams, English chairman, said he received an offer to serve in the same role at the University of North Carolina in Charlotte.

He said he opted to stay after Idaho officials told him they were willing to increase his salary to keep him here, although they could not meet Charlotte's entire offer.

As a result, Williams' annual pay jumped by 36.2 percent to \$66,019 this month.

Idaho fire crews gain ground; containment expected quickly

Favorable weather conditions gave hundreds of firefighters a boost in Idaho's backcountry Thursday, and fire bosses said they expected to contain both wildfires Friday evening.

"The weather has been cooperative," Boise National Forest spokeswoman Lynette Davis said. "It's been an opportunity to get in and get some suppression done."

The lightning-sparked Mormon Creek Fire, burning in relatively low-value timber some 17 miles east of Cascade, was being held at 440 acres as over 450 firefighters battled steep, rugged terrain to carve the final half mile of fire line in on the

stubborn lower east flank.

"The fire did not make much growth due to the higher humidity," spokeswoman Marge Leonard said.

About 100 miles to the east in the Challis National Forest, the last of 160 reinforcements moved onto the lines around the 200-acre blaze east of the North Fork of Big Creek about 30 miles west of Challis.

About two miles of fire line had to be cut, but spokeswoman Jennifer Callan said, "Now that we've got those crews up there, they should make good headway."

Fire bosses were pounding the head of that fire on the northeast with chemical retardant from air tankers in a bid to keep it from spreading into a new drainage dense

with dry timber.

That blaze was also burning in relatively low-value timber, but the Forest Service was still investigating the cause of the fire.

Neither fire was threatening any structures, and helicopters dropping water from huge suspended canvas buckets were backing up both ground assaults.

Land managers mounted all-out efforts on both blazes, the first major wildfires in Idaho this year, because of the severe dry conditions in the backcountry.

Officials said the state's forests and range are as dry now as they were a year ago when fire blackened 200,000 acres and caused \$100 million in losses.

Ada sheriff, state may reach agreement

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Department of Corrections may ask for a little more flexibility by giving its overcrowded prison system at least 30 days to pick up state-sentenced prisoners from county jails.

Corrections Director Richard Vernon said a "30-day rule" would help solve a legal dispute with Ada County Sheriff Vaughn Killen. Corrections would ask the Legislature to adopt the statute next session.

Vernon has appealed a 4th District Court decision that requires the retrieval of a backlog of state prisoners held in the Ada jail.

As an interim solution, Corrections has agreed to remove 18 remaining prison-bound inmates by Sept. 1 and pick up new arrivals within 15 days.

"We agreed that I would make every effort to get them out," Vernon said.

Killen said the pact is a compromise by both sides pending a final decision by the Idaho Supreme Court.

Fourth District Judge Duff McKee ruled June 5 Idaho law places the burden of housing state inmates on the state.

McKee ordered Vernon to clear out the jail backlog and collect future state-sentenced inmates within seven days.

Killen raised the legal challenge in March, claiming his overcrowded jail was being illegally weighed down with state inmates, who often wait months for a prison cell to become available.

Utah administrator says Japanese, Indians pursuing cold fusion

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Researchers in Japan and India are reporting excellent results from their cold fusion experiments, leaving no doubt the fledgling science is "very much alive," a Utah administrator says.

Fritz Will, director of the National Cold Fusion Institute, said Thursday that a recent tour of laboratories in both nations had convinced him that researchers had achieved solid evidence that fusion was occurring.

Moreover, he said the "excellent cooperation" between nuclear physicists, electrochemists and materials scientists in those nations stands in sharp contrast to the antagonistic attitudes between such scientists in the United States.

"There is no question ... they are progressing much more rapidly than we are," he said.

"They have a research environment that stimulates work, because they are not under attack."

"At the same time, when significant progress is obtained elsewhere, the unproductive controversy continues in the United States, whether or not there is cold fusion," he said.

Will blamed skeptical physicists and biased editors of some scientific publications for "deceiving the government, the media and the public at large about the true status of cold fusion and have harmed the progress of cold fusion work in the U.S.," he said.

Researchers long have sought the keys to a practical application for fusion, the power that lights the stars.

Conventional nuclear energy, or fission, splits atoms; fusion produces energy by fusing

them together. Normally, fusion has occurred only under extremes of heat and pressure.

In Japan, more than 200 scientists working in about 50 different groups on various aspects of cold fusion have detected neutrons and tritium, both considered a signature of a nuclear process, Will said.

In addition, Japanese researchers are beginning to focus on generation of excess heat, the same evidence cited by fusion pioneers B. Stanley Pons of the University of Utah and his British colleague, Martin Fleischmann.

The pair ignited an ongoing scientific furor in March 1989, when they announced they had achieved a sustained nuclear fusion reaction in an experiment involving electrically charged palladium and platinum immersed in a beaker of deuterium oxide, or heavy water.

Pons and Fleischmann said they measured

more energy, in the form of heat, coming from the device — called a cell — than they put into it.

In India, about 70 scientists working in 15 groups at three separate labs also have detected tritium and neutron generation as well as heat, Will said.

In a related announcement, Will said analyses of 50 palladium rods, some used in fusion experiments, had found no evidence of tritium contamination.

Earlier this year, Kevin Wolf of Texas A&M University found that some palladium he had used in his work may already have contained traces of tritium.

Will subsequently ordered an analysis of all the palladium at the institute.

He said Thursday that early results indicated there was no excess tritium in 50 samples, including a dozen that had been used in Russian experiments and eight used in cells from the laboratory of John Bockris, a

chemist at Texas A&M.

Meantime, Will said, a matrix of 32 cells under observation at the NCFI was continuing to produce excess heat at a rate of between 5 percent and 20 percent greater than the energy put in.

The institute was founded after the Utah Legislature appropriated \$5 million. Since then, attempts to obtain corporate and government sponsors have met with little success.

Indeed, said Will, the institute's application for a \$172,000 grant from the Electric Power Research Institute may have been jeopardized by a University of Utah physicist who called an EPRI official to counsel him against approving the funding.

Will would not name the physicist, but he said he had talked to him and confirmed that the call was made.

EPRI, however, has yet to decide on the proposal, Will said.

Judge delays sentence in murder case

POCATELLO (AP) — An eastern Idaho judge will spend the next several weeks mulling over information about convicted murderer Ricky Beebe before he sentences the Pocatello teenager for last year's slaying of a Washington man.

Following a daylong court hearing Wednesday, 6th District Judge Lynn Winnill said it would be early August before he imposes the sentence.

Beebe, 19, pleaded guilty two months ago to the May 27, 1989, murder of Greg Neilson of Tacoma. Neilson's decomposed body was found a month later in the Scout Mountain area. An autopsy showed he had been shot three times in the back of the head.

In return for the guilty plea, prosecutors dropped any possibility of a death sentence, leaving Beebe facing at least a life term with a minimum 10 years in prison. Lesser charges of robbery and grand theft against Beebe and the criminal case against his wife were also dropped.

But Bannock County Prosecutor Larry EchoHawk asked for a minimum prison term of 25 years, calling the murder a premeditated act of a drug user.

"I wish more than anything that it'd never happened," Beebe told the judge.

5-year-old killed by accidental shot

BOISE (AP) — A 5-year-old Ada County boy has died from an accidental shooting, the fifth young gunshot victim in the area in 1990.

Michael Lindquist, 9:17 p.m. on Wednesday of a "massive injury gunshot wound to the chest," said a nursing supervisor at St. Luke's Regional Medical Center.

Surgeons operated on the boy for more than four hours.

"It appears to be an accidental shooting, not self-inflicted," Ada County Coroner Erwin Sonnenberg said, adding he believed the weapon was a rifle.

The boy was shot in or near his home, neighbor Julie Roxburgh said.

In the past four years in southern Idaho at least 12 boys have died as a result of accidental shootings.

State faces challenge in 2nd year of lottery

BOISE (AP) — In one year of operation, Idaho Lottery sales have brought in more than twice what officials predicted, but they face an enormous challenge in the second year.

The Idaho Lottery, which celebrated its first birthday on Wednesday, topped \$60 million, far beyond the \$25 million officials originally expected to clear.

"All but two states have seen a fall-off the second year" in proceeds, said Idaho Lottery Director Wally Hedrick. "We intend to be the

third state that doesn't see a fall-off."

Of 33 states with lotteries, only Florida and Wisconsin continued the full steam ahead after their first offerings.

"I think they were creative. They worked at it. You can't sit on your laurels," Hedrick said.

This fall, the state will start its own lotto game, called "Idaho's Fantastic Five." Idaho's answer to the Oregon Megabucks game will use the same computers as Lotto America.

Players will pick five numbers from a field of 32. Weekly jackpots will range about \$25,000 to \$50,000.

The Idaho Lottery, narrowly approved by voters in the 1989 general election, exceeded expectations from the beginning, paying off its \$1 million startup costs in less than six weeks and chugging past the \$25 million sales mark at four months.

Of the \$60 million in first-year ticket sales... About 48 percent, or \$28 million, was paid out in prizes. The average nationwide is about 50 percent.

The school building account will receive 13.25 percent, or \$8 million. Each school district will gain a portion of the funds.

The state's Permanent Building Fund will earn the same amount to finance new state structures. The rest of the \$60 million covers operation and promotional costs for the lottery, as well as commissions for the 1,400 retailers who sell tickets. The money, to be distributed July 27, is desperately needed in Meridian, said Hedrick.

ISU education professor doubles as ice cream man

POCATELLO (AP) — In winter, Dr. Richard Sagness helps train the teachers of tomorrow as a professor in Idaho State University's College of Education.

But in summer, he becomes a hero to small children and a friend to the calorie-deprived.

They call him Dr. Ice Cream. "It's a real tough way to spend the summer," Sagness chuckled as he leaned over his ice cream cart at downtown Pocatello's Simplex Square.

"I suppose some people think it's beneath my dignity to be doing this, but I think that's nonsense."

It's not that he is trying to earn a few extra dollars for that resort vacation or that he needs the cash because his university salary will not get him through the summer. Sagness claims his wife makes him do it.

For a few hours a day, a few days each week, the former college dean turns ice cream vendor,

guiding his cart to the city's gathering places to peddle pralines and cream, peanut butter and chocolate, chocolate chip mint ... the list goes on.

"He's doing this very willingly," maintained Donna Sagness, who owns a local ice cream shop. But she conceded the cart has been a good way to keep her husband out of trouble.

"He's worth what I pay him, which is—nothing," she said. "He's good with the cart, but we have to watch him when he's in the store. He'll eat everything, including the flavors that nobody else will eat, like brandied fruitcake."

Sagness admits his love of ice cream, especially when it's free, keeps him on the job.

"When I was a kid, I worked at a soda fountain. The owner said, 'Eat all you want, because eventually you'll get tired of it,'" he recalled.

Gem appeals court lets murder conviction stand

BOISE (AP) — Even though evidence of drug deals was improperly admitted in the murder trial of a Boise man, it wasn't enough to overturn his conviction, the Idaho Court of Appeals says.

The court on Thursday unanimously upheld the conviction of Jerry Brazzell of second-degree murder in an Ada County slaying, and the subsequent life sentence ordered by 4th District Judge Alan Schwartzman, with a minimum of 10 years in prison.

Court records show Brazzell and another man, Mike Williams, were charged with killing Tony Kline. The men were charged separately, and Williams later made a plea bargain and testified against Brazzell.

His appeal contended, among other things, that the judge erred in admitting evidence of Brazzell's prior drug activity.

The prosecution contended that the drug evidence was important because of Brazzell's testimony that he had few prior contacts with Williams, and because it showed a drug-related motive for the killing.

"There was no evidence of any transactions involving drugs between Kline and Brazzell," the court said. "Consequently, the jury could

do no more than speculate that Kline had dealt in drugs with Brazzell. Moreover, the evidence was unfairly prejudicial, casting Brazzell in the role of a drug dealer," the court said.

The evidence was undisputed that Brazzell shot Kline twice with a shotgun, and Williams' testimony was presented only to support a first-degree murder claim.

The jury rejected the state's first-degree murder allegation and returned a verdict of second-degree murder, which was consistent with the evidence showing an unplanned homicide," the court said.

In other decisions Thursday: The Court of Appeals upheld the awarding of \$1 in damages in a Ada County lawsuit between W. Eugene and Alice Strate and Cambridge Telephone Co., and dismissal of Cambridge's countersuit.

The Idaho Supreme Court agreed with the Industrial Commission that a laborer, George Cole, was not entitled to disability benefits from Stokely Van Camp, which formerly operated a Gem County cannery.

The court unanimously upheld a commission finding that Cole didn't prove a 1982 on-the-job injury caused back problems.

Bus driver jailed after fast run

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — A bus driver jailed after passengers complained that he took them on a high speed ride across the Idaho Panhandle has been fired, Greyhound Line officials said Thursday.

Four passengers were injured, including one who was hospitalized after the wild ride on Interstate 90 on the Butte, Mont., to Spokane run, the Kootenai County Sheriff's Office said in a news release.

"We are sorry it happened. The driver did not act according to Greyhound policies, and therefore, his employment was terminated," Greyhound

spokeswoman Liz Dunn said from the firm's headquarters at Dallas, Texas.

Greyhound driver Nick S. Eisenbarth, 29, of Spokane, Wash., was booked for investigation of reckless driving, the sheriff's department release said.

A passenger who had been let off the bus called Coeur d'Alene police about 1 a.m. Thursday to complain that the vehicle was being driven in a reckless manner by a driver who refused to let other passengers off, the release said.

ICC approves branch line bid by Intermountain Western

NAMPA (AP) — Intermountain Western Railroad Co. has won Interstate Commerce Commission approval to purchase about 350 miles of branch lines in southwest Idaho.

The long-awaited sale by the Union Pacific Railroad should be completed by late summer. Intermountain Western expects to move its headquarters from Boise to Nampa in September and start operations by Oct. 1, officials said.

"Nampa is the hub of the operation," said Bill Glynn, head of the company's railroad subsidiary.

"Most of the branch lines either originate or terminate there."

With federal approval in hand, Intermountain Western President Rudy Rossmann said he hoped the sale

would be finalized before the fall harvest season. Negotiations began nearly three years ago.

In addition to seven branch lines, the sale involves some buildings including the old Pacific Fruit Express repair shops in Nampa and some specialized freight cars used to transport logs.

Union Pacific will continue to own main line truckage through the area, and the sale will not affect Amtrak passenger service or include the Union Pacific depot in Boise.

Officials were uncertain how many Union Pacific employees will be hired by the new owners.

"We will advertise all the jobs that we have and anyone who wants can apply for those jobs," Glynn said.

Movies move in on old newspaper building

Filmmakers like the pink color, Spanish facade

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The printing press and ornate lobby are real, and so is the city editor's desk. The gunshots and blood are not.

Movie makers are finding a bonanza in the unusual setting of the Spanish Renaissance landmark that once housed the Los Angeles Herald Examiner.

At least a dozen productions, not counting commercials, have been filmed at the domed building since the newspaper folded on Nov. 2, 1989, according to city permit files.

Clint Eastwood moved in for Warner Bros.' soon-to-be-released movie "The Rookie." So did Universal's "Murder, She Wrote."

"It's really an ideal place for filming," said Ken Johnson, site coordinator for The Hollywood Location Co. "There's such a wide variety of spaces and looks... directors of photography just love the windows in the mail room."

Completed in 1915, the faded pink palace was designed by Julia Morgan, who created William Randolph Hearst's Castle at San Simeon. It sprawls over more than half a city block.

Movie and commercial making will continue at least into the fall, said Maxwell McCrahen, the former Herald Examiner editor.

He said the parent Hearst Corp. had no plans to sell it but was considering renting it to full-time tenants.

The ornate lobby has been an exclusive men's club and a hotel. A stenciled notice to inmates makes the newspaper pass for a prison day-room.

Around the corner, there's a de-

...ective squad room; you can tell by the "Robbery-Homicide" plate on the city editor's desk.

Sometimes the building shapes a movie.

"Occasionally they'll still be

writing when they scout a location and see something with such good production values that they'll rewrite the script to get it in," said Johnson.

He said a look at the row of hulk-

ing presses was enough to send script writers back to work on the TV movie "Rainbow Drive." The bad guy wound up meeting his end being crunched in Press No. 9, still grimy with Herald Examiner ink.

Keillor slows down — or so he claims

He may have moved to New York, Garrison Keillor says, but that doesn't mean he's learned to talk fast.

"It's too late for me to talk fast," Keillor says.

In truth, he adds, the older he gets the slower he speaks — possibly because "I have less to say."

Garrison Keillor with less to say? Keillor, the man who brought narrative back to radio? Keillor, the best-selling author of "Lake Wobegon Days," "Leaving Home" and a couple of other books? The prolific magazine writer whose work has appeared, chiefly in the New Yorker, for 20 years? The monologist who's leading "The Sweet Corn Show," a talk-and-music revue on an 18-city tour this month? That guy?

All right, maybe he has slowed down a tad. "I haven't done much writing," he admits, "for the last four or five days."

Keillor doesn't blame this egregious lapse on all the traveling he's doing. Airplanes are as conducive to writing as any other setting, thanks to his laptop computer, Keillor said.

Nor does he find traveling especially distracting.

"To travel as we're traveling seems very static," he says. "Most hotel rooms are identical. There's a standard style of hotel furniture — not sold in stores" and a standard array of paint colors never seen in homes, not to mention "pictures on walls" "not meant to be looked at."

Lapse or no, Keillor has been writing. "I'm working on a new novel which has been in the works a long, long time, about the end of radio and the advent of television."

The novel is set in Chicago in the '50s. "So far my hero, to my dismay, turns out to be a television guy," a

man enjoying "great success."

"So far in the novel he's not punished for that."

Keillor is able to tour during the summer because his radio show, "American Radio Company of the Air," is on vacation until Oct. 6. He does 26 radio shows a year, half in New York, the other half on the road.

His previous show, "A Prairie Home Companion," usually emanated from Keillor's native Minnesota but also traveled. He gets back to Minnesota "about every other month" to visit relatives and friends, he says.

"His 'Sweet Corn Show' isn't on radio but it could be," Keillor says. "These are concerns that are meant for people to listen. There's not a great deal to see."

Besides Keillor, the performers to listen to — or see — include guitarist Chet Atkins and his band, Robin & Linda Williams and Keillor's 21-year-old son, Jason.

"He's a new wave guitarist forced to play in a sweet ballad style. He has to live with his old man's musical shortcomings. He does it well," Keillor says.

Chris Elliott moves from 'Late Night' to Fox

LOS ANGELES — Want your own prime-time series? Want to win Emmys and influential friends? Try Chris Elliott's formula for success.

In 1983, Elliott was working as a tour guide at NBC's New York City studios. It sounds like Robert Morse starting in the mail room in "How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying," right?

Sure, it was a low-level job, but Elliott parlayed the grunt work into a chance to meet David Letterman. It was a case of the right guy at the right time.

Letterman wanted to take his mother on the studio tour, and you-know-who was the guide. Elliott offered to let the "Late Night" host by on the children's admission.

Letterman responded by hiring Elliott to another low-level job — runner for "Late Night." That meant answering phones, making coffee and running the office copier.

Although Elliott's coffee and copies were of poor quality, his office antics earned him an on-camera appearance. Soon, the former tour guide was popping up as one of several characters: the Guy Under the Seats, the Panicky Guy, the Fugitive Guy.

Armed with four Emmys won as a member of Letterman's writing team, Elliott is about to invade prime time with "Get a Life," one of 10 series Fox Broadcasting will premiere this fall.

Where does this leave him with Letterman? "I haven't told Dave yet," joked Elliott, the producer, writer and star of "Get a Life." "I am probably going to go back (to 'Late Night') about 10 times in the year, if I can."

"Get a Life" will follow the happy-

CLEVELAND (AP) — The precision-cropped hair is mostly gray, but those famous blue eyes remain clear, his skin unlined and his body trim.

At 64, Academy Award-winning actor Paul Newman races on, juggling success in three high pressure, demanding professions: acting, the food business and auto racing. And his passions run high in all.

When he's not directing, acting or promoting his line of Newman's Own food products, he takes to the track. With his latest movie, "Mr. and Mrs. Bridge," ready for release this fall, Newman's ready to race.

This season, he's driving a limited schedule on the SCCA's Trans-Am circuit as the teammate of 22-year-old Scott Sharp, the son of Bob Sharp, co-owner of Newman-Sharp Racing. Newman has watched the younger driver improve almost daily and laments one small part of aging.

A young driver like Scott, who's got a great gift, just keeps getting faster and faster," Newman said during an interview before finishing 16th in a recent Trans-Am race in Cleveland.

"Young kids like Scott think about winning. I think about whether I'm going to have a pulse," he joked.

"When you get older and older, you start slowing down. Everything is off one-50th of 1 percent. Your eyes are a little off, your reflexes, touch — everything. You multiply that by just a factor of 1 percent, that's two or three seconds a lap."

But Newman, whose interest in auto racing was generated on the set of "Winning" in 1968, doesn't regret his late start in the sport he now loves.

"I started at the right time. I had the right kind of equipment," he said. "I don't regret anything. It came at the right time. I was getting bored acting."

Asked if racing revived his interest in other things, he joked that his wife, actress Joanne Woodward, says it saved their marriage. Woodward co-stars in "Mr. and Mrs. Bridge," a chronicle of a middle-class American family.

Turning serious again, Newman

said: "You become passionate about one thing, it leads back into something else. If you can gain a sense of passion and commitment in your life in one arena, it's bound to bleed back into other arenas."

Newman, who has earned four national amateur driving titles and two Trans-Am victories since beginning

his racing career in 1972, says he never gave driving a race car much thought until he played an Indy-car driver in "Winning."

What was it that attracted him to the sport?

"I don't know," he said. "It was just out there, like anything else, to be learned. I started off very slowly,

very cautious, as I start off everything."

Since he has been successful at so much, people tend to believe things come easily to Newman. He insists the opposite is true.

"The light that you think you emanate is not necessarily the light that other people see," he said. "You think of yourself as a shy, retiring whatever it is, and some other people will see you in an entirely different way."

"I had always seen (tennis star Ivan) Lendl as a guy with such a gift. The gift came before the work, but not according to Lendl. He says if he lays off for three weeks, he's garbage."

"You have to constantly learn. Obviously, you have to start with some kind of gift, but people don't understand that. I don't have a gift for anything. I've only had a gift of pursuit."

"That's certainly true in acting. I can't look at the work I did 20 years ago. I can't even watch it."

In all the things I started to attack — football, tennis — I had a gift for it at all. I had no gift for racing, either. It's just something that I really wanted to do."

Scott Sharp, sitting nearby, said, "Aw, Paul, you look good at everything you do."

"Come watch my tennis game sometime," Newman said, laughing. "I really did want to play tennis really badly. I was awful."

"I quit playing tennis, then I went back to it in about a year. I served the ball and the (other) guy hit it back to me. I jiggled my feet and it sounded like a typewriter. All these feet running around looking for a position of assurance. There were two feet down there and it sounded like a stampede or like I was tap dancing. It was uncertainty. You don't understand that until you see yourself doing it."

"I'm not a natural at things. For instance, I'm a terrible dancer. I have no gift for dancing. I like to dance with Joanne, but she's the only one that will tolerate me."

His schedule is jet-set, but more because of the multiple careers he is juggling than any need for glamour

or celebrity.

"I was never able to delegate responsibility and I do have a full plate," Newman said. "The thing you don't realize is somebody sends you a script, as a friend, and all of a sudden you're devoting five days and taking 20 pages of notes. There goes the whole damn week."

"I've got a script now that the chances of my doing are probably one in 20. But you spend the time."

Will Newman, who remains in shape by running and working out on a stationary bike, stay around racing for a while?

"I have never made a plan about anything in my life and I don't see it starting to happen now," he said. "I still enjoy (racing). I don't enjoy going as slow as I'm going, but I still enjoy the competition."

Among the people that Newman has introduced to his adopted sport

is Tom Cruise, his co-star in the 1987 film "The Color of Money." Cruise became so enamored of auto racing he initiated and starred in "Days of Thunder," a movie about stock car racing.

Newman politely refused to criticize the movie, but he did say, "I think it will be very good for racing."


Asked if he thinks a great movie has yet been made about auto racing, Newman replied, "I'm not one to think my own horn, but 'Winning,' it seems to me, may have been the best movie about racing."

"Not because the racing footage was the best or anything, but because the people integrated into the racing. And, usually you find that people are inserted, or transplanted on top of, or glued to the story."

"Great movies ultimately have to be about people."

The pay is \$35 a day — \$399 for anyone with a speaking part and there will be several of those, Hall says. Interesting-looking vehicles, trap wagons or other agricultural equipment that can be used for background scenery were also being sought.

"I've already told them, by God, if I don't get a part I want a credit at the end of the movie that says 'special thanks to the mayor of Genesee, Randy Hall,'" he said.

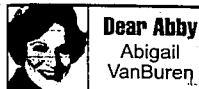

'Today' debacle cost \$20 million

LOS ANGELES — How much in dollars and cents has the much-publicized "Today" show debacle including the decision to dump co-anchor Jane Pauley for Deborah Norville — cost NBC and its affiliates?

About \$20 million, NBC News President Michael Gartner said.

Gartner opened a press conference by acknowledging "mistakes" and "screw-ups" in his handling of "Today" last year, especially in the transition last December from Pauley to Norville as Bryant Gumbel's co-anchor.

Goofy 'Quick Change' is breath of fresh air

At last, they have sent in the clown. "Quick Change," with Bill Murray behind a loopy-lipsticked grin and double-humps of white eye shadow like the McDonald's arches, with a red rubber ball for a nose, is just what we needed most this machine-gun

mad summer: a quick change into subversive hilarity, where airplanes do not incinerate hundreds as terrorists smear them on the runway and the old Martian dome does not pop, sucking the oxygen out of a thousand pairs of lungs.

This movie honors the anarchic spirit of comedy by loving the bank robber as fervently as it loves the policeman, and it rewards them equally. It takes the dark and unmanageable pit that New York has become and manages to suck the comedy out of its commonplace horrors — such as taxi drivers who speak a language as yet undiscovered by the Harvard Department of Anthropology. It is lunacy compounded by piracy (of Martin Scorsese's "After Hours," which it is much funnier than) as played on the Stradivarius of Murray's exquisite deadpan, that sea of tranquility. Even festooned under his bright

clown's makeup, Murray's mug remains as remote and mysterious as a myth or a haiku: he is the new-age Buster Keaton, somehow initiated into the secret harmonies of comedy, subtly gifted with the ability to underplay for maximum concussive impact. He alone appears to know how to give a line, otherwise dull as a dinner knife, a certain resonant ping of hilarity.

In the R-rated "Quick Change," Murray plays a robber who, dressed as a clown ("That's Mr. Bozo to you," he says, pulling a Beretta on the

guard), slips into a mid-town Manhattan bank two minutes before closing, as the first step in an ingenious plan to separate the bank and its money from each other. Two cohorts are played by Geena Davis and Randy Quaid; the genius in charge of catching them is played by Jason Robards.

Whatever Murray has is hard to define: He's not a manic laugh-grabber or a master of shtick. He does not do jokes. It is attitude: He is what the '90s want to be. Laid back, his lids heavy, his jowls flabby, his lack of self-consciousness like a bulletproof

vast, he manages somehow to embody the spirit of hip. He never tries, that's one thing. He is so relaxed he is almost Zen; there is almost something cartoon-like in his face. Thus, in a movie almost chaotic with plot, he is the spirit of anti-plot; he just stands there doing nothing, getting 99 percent of the laughs, getting you to love him because of, not in spite of, his laziness.

Having managed to split the bank, the larcenous trio discovers that the robbery was the easy part. New York is the hard part. City's inclination toward chaos asserts itself everywhere as it whimsically forbids the three of them to leave town. But all the way through, the movie makes us see the truth about New York: It is not doing this to them because they are bad. No, it does this to everyone. It just likes to mess people up.

Quaid goes a bit over the top as the moronic third banana; but Davis is fine as Murray's girlfriend, who is subtly distanced by the changes that seem to transfigure Murray as, one by one, he meets, then defeats the obstacles that New York puts in the way. And Robards, solid as a foundation, has a nice turn as the disillusioned but still professional lawyer.

But in the end — as in the middle and the beginning — it's Murray, Murray, Murray. I don't know; it looks like a "Quick Change" kind of summer to me.

'Dice Man' tolerable in brainless movie

Has the Simpson-Bruckheimer signature come to mean the flimsiest story buried under glittering production values? What relationships the movie has aren't between Tom Cruise and Nicole Kidman, but between Cruise and Robert Duvall, putting full, ornery life into another of Southern peckerwood. The movie's excitement comes from its racing footage; its massive case of attitude comes from the producers' assurance that they can retell the formula of "Top Gun."

DICK TRACY (PG). Warren Beatty's vision of a comic strip on film comes in paint-bright colors with nice, over-the-top dialogue, a gaggle of crisp performances and one with million-dollar moxie. It's a surfeit of enormous style, with a sure sense of itself. You may not exactly brood about the inner lives of these characters for days after you leave the theater — then again, for better or worse, that may be one of the definitions of a summer movie. To take the words out of the mouth of another Tracy, "There ain't much meat, but what there is is cherec."

DIE HARD 2 (R). This is the most cheerfully preposterous film of a jaw-dropping summer, which is not to say it's not fun. It's simply orchestrated Looney Tunes. Even Bruce Willis' redoubtable detective, John McClane, keeps shaking his head over his part in all the action. But all in all, this sequel is a lively three-ring circus; just don't be fussy about logic or timing, and for heaven's sake, watch out for falling glass.

GHOST (PG-13). The movie's slogan is "Believe," not an unreasonable request. But even those who'd be happy to comply must get past a certain woolly-mindedness to the script and a production stiffened to the point of sickness. With some of its actors — Demi Moore as the cracked-voice, desolate lover; Whoopi Goldberg as an extremely reluctant spirit go-between and Vin-

cent Schiavelli as an irascible, subway-dwelling ghost — things are in the best hands possible. But Patrick Swayze as a corporate New York banker? Never in 7 million corporate years.

GREMLINS 2 (PG-13). After waging war on Norman Rockwell-Frank Capra small-town America in the first "Gremlins," the grinning, green little beasts take on New York City here, running riot through Manhattan's Clump Center and all the ferocious cartoon satire director Joe Dante and writer Charlie Haas can pump up. The movie seems constricted — logistics seem to have ruled out a full scale invasion of the streets — and the conversion of John Glover's Daniel Clump from bad to good seems a little tramped up. But the sequel is funnier and fiercer than the first — and Tony Randall talks a great Brain Gremlin.

JETSON'S: THE MOVIE (G). The film makers can't seem to decide if they're recreating the innocent humor of the early '60s TV show or making a with-it entertainment for the contemporary youth audience, and don't do either very well. The only interesting animation is a two-minute clip to Tiffany's song "You and Me"; the rest is Saturday morning kiddie on a big screen.

THE JUNGLE BOOK (G). The Disney artists took little more than the names of Rudyard Kipling's characters, but the film's slapstick comedy, upbeat songs and polished animation have lost none of their appeal, 23 years after its original release. This high-spirited romp will delight children — and parents weary of action films with body counts that exceed their box-office grosses.

Goofy 'Quick Change' is breath of fresh air

At last, they have sent in the clown. "Quick Change," with Bill Murray behind a loopy-lipped grin and double-humps of white eye shadow like the McDonald's arches, with a red rubber ball for a nose, is just what we needed most this machine-gun

clown's makeup, Murray's mug remains as remote and mysterious as a myth or a haiku: he is the new-age Buster Keaton, somehow initiated into the secret harmonies of comedy, subtly gifted with the ability to underplay for maximum concussive impact. He alone appears to know how to give a line, otherwise dull as a dinner knife, a certain resonant ping of hilarity.

In the R-rated "Quick Change," Murray plays a robber who, dressed as a clown ("That's Mr. Bozo to you," he says, pulling a Beretta on the

guard), slips into a mid-town Manhattan bank two minutes before closing, as the first step in an ingenious plan to separate the bank and its money from each other. Two cohorts are played by Geena Davis and Randy Quaid; the copper in charge of catching them is played by Jason Robards. Whatever Murray has is hard to define: He's not a manic laugh-grabber or a master of shtick. He does not do jokes. It is attitude: He is what the '90s want to be. Laid back, his lids heavy, his jowls flabby, his lack of self-consciousness like a bulletproof vest, he manages somehow to embody the spirit of hip. He never tries; that's one thing. He is so relaxed he is almost Zen; there is almost something cartoon-like in his face.

Thus, in a movie almost chaotic with plot, he is the spirit of anti-plot; he just stands there doing nothing, getting 99 percent of the laughs, getting you to love him because of, not in spite of, his laziness.

Having managed to split the bank, the larcenous trio discovers that the robbery was the easy part. New York is the hard part. It does this to everyone. It just likes to mess people up.

Quaid goes a bit over the top as the moronic third banana; but Davis is fine as Murray's girlfriend, who is subtly distanced by the changes that seem to transfigure Murray as, one by one, he meets, then defeats the obstacles that New York puts in the way. And Robards, solid as a foundation, has a nice turn as the disillusioned but still professional lawman.

But in the end — as in the middle and the beginning — it's Murray, Murray, Murray. I don't know; it looks like a "Quick Change" kind of summer to me.

mad summer: a quick change into subsversive hilarity, where airplane do not incinerate hundreds as terrorists smear them on the runway and the old Martian dome does not pop, sucking the oxygen out of a thousand pairs of lungs.

This movie honors the anarchic spirit of comedy by loving the bank robber as fervently as it loves the policeman, and it rewards them equally. It takes the dark and unmanageable pit that New York has become and manages to suck the comedy out of its commonplace horrors — such as taxi drivers who speak a language as yet undeciphered by the Harvard Department of Anthropology. It is lunacy compounded by piracy (of Martin Scorsese's "After Hours," which it is much funnier than) as played on the Stradivarius of Murray's exquisite deadpan, that sea of tranquility.

'Dice Man' tolerable in brainless movie

THE ADVENTURES OF FORD FAIRLANE (R). In his first starring role in the movies, Andrew Dice Clay plays a private eye who specializes in mae. In the industry cases. He's more genial and inoffensive than in his stage act but the movie is basically a souped-up nothing.

ANOTHER 48 HRS. (R). Eddie Murphy and Nick Nolte re-team eight years later for this crunch-and-thud sequel. Murphy is better than he's been in awhile, but Nolte, who has become a great actor in the intervening years, looks woefully uncomfortable. Walter Hill handles the action sequences with mechanical verve.

BACK TO THE FUTURE PART III (PG). An appealing if ultimately disposable conclusion to the Marty McFly saga. In this one, set mostly in the Old West, Doc falls in love.

DAYS OF THUNDER (PG-13). Whoosh!! "Days of Thunder" just streaked in, fast as a race car paint job and about as flat. Has the Simonson-Bruckheimer signature come to mean the flimsiest story buried under glittering production values? What relationships the movie has aren't between Tom Cruise and Nicole Kidman, but between Cruise and Robert Duvall, putting full, ornery life into another of Southern peckerwood. The movie's excitement comes from its racing footage; its massive case of attitude comes from the producers' assurance that they can retell the formula of "Top Gun."

DICK TRACY (PG). Warren Beatty's vision of a comic-strip on film comes in paint box-bright colors with nicely irrelevant dialogue, a gaggle of crisp performances and one with million-dollar moxie. It's a film of enormous style, with a sure sense of humor. You may not excuse his brood about the inner lives of these characters for days after you leave the theater — then again, for better or worse, that may be one of the definitions of a summer movie. To take the words out of the mouths of another Tracy, "There ain't much meat, but what there is is cheese."

DIE HARD 2 (R). This is the most cheerfully preposterous film of a jaw-dropping summer, which is not to say it's not fun, it's simply over-theated Looney Tunes. Even Bruce Willis' redoubtable detective, John McClane, keeps shaking his head over his part all the action. But all in all, this sequel is a lively three-ring circus; just don't be fussy about logic or timing, and for heaven's sake, watch out for falling glass.

GHOST (PG-13). The movie's slogan is "Believe," not an unreasonable request. But even those who'd be happy to comply must get past a certain woolly-mindedness to its script and a production prettified to the point of stickiness. With some of its actors — Demi Moore as the cracked-voice, desolate lover; Whoopi Goldberg as an extremely reluctant spirit go-between and Vin-

cent Schiavelli as an irascible, subway-dwelling ghost — things are in the best hands possible. But Patrick Swayze as a corporate New York banker? Never in 7 million corporate years.

GREMLINS 2 (PG-13). After fraying war on Norman Rockwell-Frank Capra small-town America in the first "Gremlins," the grinning, green little beasties take on New York City here, running riot through Manhattan's Clump Center and all the ferocious cartoon satire director Joe Dante and writer Charlie Haas can pump up. The movie seems constructed — logistics seem to have ruled out a full scale invasion of the streets — and the conversion of John Glover's Daniel Clump from bad to good seems a little tramped up. But the sequel is funnier and fiercer than the first — and Tony Randall talks a great Brain Gremlin.

JETSONS: THE MOVIE (G). The film makers can't seem to decide if they're recreating the innocent humor of the early '60s TV show or making a with-it entertainment for the contemporary youth audience, and don't do either very well. The only interesting animation is a two-minute clip to Tiffany's song "You and Me"; the rest is Saturday morning kiddie on a big screen.

THE JUNGLE BOOK (G). The Disney artists took little more than the names of Rudyard Kipling's characters, but the film's slapstick comedy, upbeat songs and polished animation have lost none of their appeal, 23 years after its original release. This high-spirited romp will delight children — and parents weary of action films with body counts that exceed their box-office grosses.

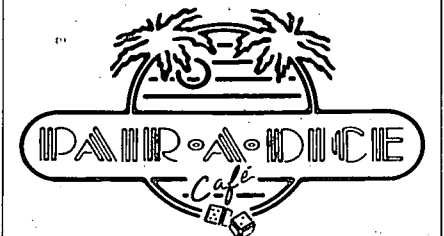

'Unsolved Mysteries' allows viewers to try and answer the unanswerable

NBC's Wednesday-night hit "Unsolved Mysteries," hosted by Robert Stack, is the most successful of the reality-based disaster and crime shows.

What makes the series work? "There's an acceptance quotient on the part of the audience that has nothing to do with creativity on our end," Stack admits. "As Brandon Tartikoff said, 'If I knew what audiences liked, I'd be the richest man in the world.'"

Although Stack insists that the reason audiences choose to watch is difficult to define, he does single out certain elements that make "Unsolved Mysteries" successful. "There's a definite personalizing," he says thoughtfully, "mixed in with a fear of crime. A woman with a 16-year-old daughter wrote me a letter, and she said that the show kept her daughter safe. She said her daughter no longer had the desire to wander around at night, after seeing what had happened to some kids who did."

Stack also cites the updates, which give the current status of past reports, as a force that keeps viewers tuned in. "They remind the audience that these stories are real and ongoing," Stack says.

"Plus, these stories are unsolved," Stack emphasizes. "It's the eternal question — looking for an answer for something for which there is no answer."

Eternal questions aside, Stack claims that he also reaps a lot of personal satisfaction from hosting the show. "We're bringing together

families," he claims. "There's a nice feeling, a feeling that you're doing some good. It's nice when you're allowed in someone's home; you sort of become part of the furniture."

Stack also acknowledges that he has a strong belief in law and order. "I've always respected people who risked their lives for their country," he says staunchly. "There's a war between us and the bad guys."

For the new season, Stack doesn't anticipate too many changes in the show's format. "We may go international a bit," he acknowledges. "But it's a little eerie and depressing to look at the headlines — there are so many stories around us that there's always something for us to cover."

That seems to be part of the show's allure. Maybe the bad guys

will get caught, and maybe that will make the world a little bit safer. It gives audiences the feeling of assuming some control over the world.

And Stack knows about bad guys. He's been asked to consider starring in a new version of "The Untouchables," the 1959-63 series in which he starred as Eliot Ness. "They've been trying to break my arm to get me to do Ness again," he admits, "but I don't know. This is a part that's close to my heart. If it's a perfectly wonderful script, I might do it. I won't just put on a uniform and march around. That would be a disservice."

Soggy All-Star game almost gave CBS the winning edge in Nielsen standings

NEW YORK (AP) — The American League's soggy, 2-0 victory over the National League in baseball's All-Star game helped lift CBS into a close, second-place finish for the week, according to A.C. Nielsen Co. ratings.


The rain-delayed game, in which the National League was held to two hits and which featured an episode of "Rescue 911" during its 68-minute, seventh-inning rain delay, averaged an 18.5 rating and a 33 share.

A rating point represents 921,000 households. A share is the percentage of all TV sets in use tuned to a show in its time period. Baseball is the national pastime.

Overall, NBC narrowly won the week of July 9, its ninth consecutive weekly ratings victory and its 40th in 43 weeks, with a 9.8 rating and a 19 share. CBS was one-tenth of a rating point back at 9.7 and a 19 share.

ABC came in third at 9.1, with an 18 share. The Fox Broadcasting Co. had a 6.2 rating and a 12 share.

"The numbers are very close all over the place," said analyst David Marans of the J. Walter Thompson advertising agency. "Among adults

Palmer killer is still at large

LOS ANGELES — Who killed Laura Palmer? Mark Frost, the executive producer of ABC's "Twin Peaks," isn't saying — no surprise there.

Frost, to be sure, was rather cryptic when he took a few questions about "Peaks" from TV critics at a press conference held to promote his new Fox TV show, "American Chronicles."

About the season premiere of "Peaks," he said: "You will find out something very, very interesting that will make you think maybe, yes, you do know who it is. ... You're going to see a person who you very definitely would assume is the killer in a compromising situation." In a brief chat outside Fox after the formal session,

Frost did confirm that the murder would be solved "within the first 13 episodes — probably sooner than that."

Frost also said he wasn't disappointed with ABC's decision to move "Peaks" to 10 p.m. Saturdays, a time when many people are out and few viewers are watching network television.
