Saddam calls for holy war

MANAMA, Bahrain — Saddam Hussein urged Arabs on Friday to join in a holy war to sweep from power the Saudi royal family, seize the Moslem holy shrines in Saudi Arabia and block U.S. warships sent to defend the kingdom.

Saddam's defiant call to take back the Moslem shrines signaled his intentions are broader than the annexation of Kuwait. His rhetoric aimed at presenting himself as a champion of Arabs and Moslems everywhere.

By inviting U.S. troops to protect Saudi Arabia, the Saudi leaders "are not only defying the Arab and Islamic nations... but are challenging God the day they put Mecca and the tomb of Mohammed under the grip of the foreigner," Saddam said in a statement read by a spokesman on television.

"Your brothers in Iraq are determined on holy war, without hesitation and without

any slowing down. We shall be victorious, God willing, and evil and corruption will be trampled wherever it is; the sun will rise on the Arabs and the Moslems and God will happy after we purify our souls and land from the foreigners."

The mention of foreigners was a clear reference to American and other Western forces in the region.

The statement appeared directed at Arab League members meeting in Cairo to find a diplomatic solution to the crisis caused by Iraq's invasion Aug. 2 of Kuwait.

Saddam has been under intense economic and military pressure since the invasion. Thousands of U.S. troops are in Saudi Arabia as part of a multinational force to defend the oil-rich kingdom, and a majority of the Arab leaders voted Friday to deploy

Arab League votes to send troops to Saudi Arabia

CAIRO, Egypt — A majority of Arab League nations agreed Friday to send Arab troops to protect Saudi Arabia from Iraqi aggression, approved economic sanctions against Baghdad and condemned the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait.

The moves were by far the strongest Arab steps against Iraq President Saddam Hussein since the Aug. 2 invasion of Kuwait.

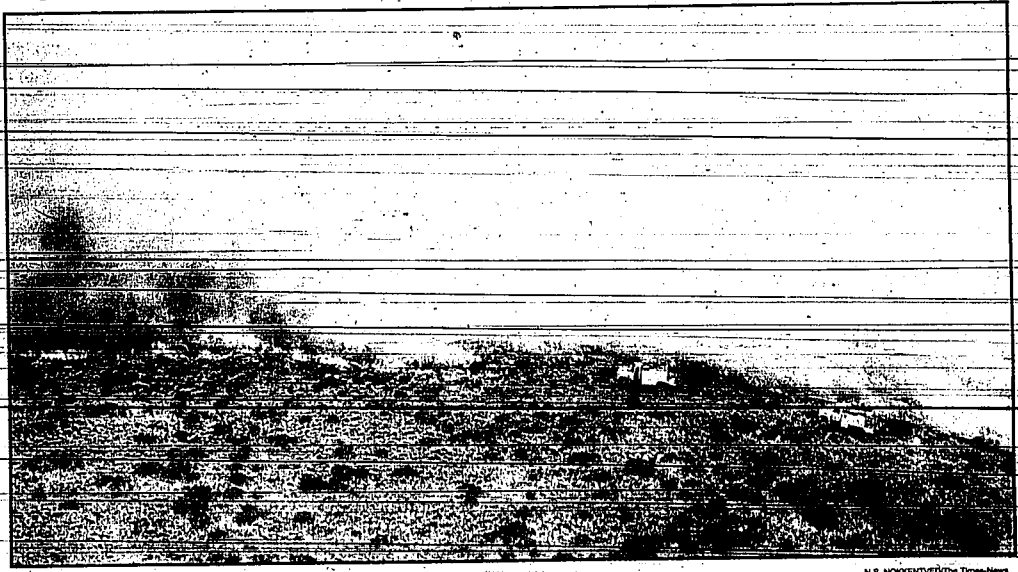
Iraq, a League member, denounced the measures and vowed that Baghdad would stand by its annexation of

Of 20 Arab League member states present, 12 supported the severest-point resolution. Libya, the Palestine Liberation Organization and Iraq voted against the package. Algeria and Yemen abstained, and Tunisia was absent. Three governments — Jordan, Sudan and Mauritania — expressed reservations and took no position.

Egypt's representative to the United Nations, Amr Moussa, told reporters details of the deployment of the Arab force would be worked out in contacts coordinated by the League's secretary.

Heat seekers

Pay keeps firefighters returning despite hardships, 'taxing' work

TWIN FALLS — Sometimes he thinks about what the weather is doing, the heat, the shifting wind. He didn't see any rats either, but he heard a couple.

Like many other firefighters, Robert LeDuc of the northern Idaho town of Priest Lake isn't sure why he does it, but he comes back every summer. Sometimes he just counts the hours and works it into dollars.

"It's a physical test of endurance," LeDuc said after his midday run from Idaho's Panhandle had cut a three-quarter-mile fire line among rock, boulders and brush along a steep canyon wall.

"This is kind of taxing on your body when it's this hot," said Mark Cochran, also of the Panhandle crew, which works for the U.S. Forest Service. "I must have drunk five gallons and I didn't have to (urinate) once."

The Panhandle crew fought a portion of the more than 10,000-acre Indian Spring fire which moved on to the Sawtooth National Forest south of Kimberly Wednesday.

Sometime Wednesday night the fire broke out of the McMullen Creek drainage into the Fifth Fork drainage. Fire commanders sent the crew down into the wild, rugged canyon to put a line around the breakout.

Armed with shovels, Pulaskis — a combination axe and

TWIN FALLS — Most of the year Anne Dolde tutors South Bend, Ind., fourth-, fifth- and sixth-graders in reading. During the summers, she fights forest fires with the Sawtooth Hotshots.

This summer, her seventh on the fire lines, she is assistant to crew superintendent Mark Barbo. She likes the contrast in lifestyles. She likes the West and the excitement of fighting fires — well, mostly it's dirty, boring and difficult, she said.

More and more women work as firefighters in a traditionally male-oriented job. The first woman joined the U.S. Forest Service's fire crews in 1979. The Sawtooth Hotshot crew of which Dolde is part

was formed in 1967 to meet a need for well-organized, well-trained fire crews. The crew, one of 60 hotshot crews nationwide, first was based in Fairfield and moved to Twin Falls in 1981.

Organization and training set apart hotshot and smokejumper crews from other fire crews. Smokejumpers form the initial attack on small fires, and hotshots fight larger established fires.

Hotshot crews get 80 hours of training every year, emphasizing safety and physical fitness. The crew remains together the whole summer, and a core group returning from year to year develops a team.

Other crews are assembled for one specific fire and get about 40 hours of training. These crews are disbanded after a fire; for another fire a new crew is assembled.

Weather change cools off blazes in Magic Valley

TWIN FALLS — A break in the weather gave firefighters in Southern Idaho a hand Friday. "It made a big difference," said Marty Sharp of the Bureau of Land Management's Shoshone office. "We even had a few raindrops."

A 20-degree drop in temperature brought some relief from the heat and kept the Thorn Creek fire from spreading. Officials Friday evening expected to have the more than 50,000-acre fire contained by about 9 o'clock that evening.

The fire started Wednesday near Idaho Highway 46 between Gooding and Fairfield and was quickly spread by high winds.

Winds continued to plague fire fighters in the South Hills fighting to control the 12,000-acre Indian Spring fire. But the 27 miles of fire line scratched out in the dirt around the fire were holding Friday evening in spite of gusty winds.

That fire started Tuesday on BEM land and burned up into the hills south of Kimberly. Wednesday the fire crossed onto the Sawtooth National Forest. More than 200 people fought the fire.

The Forest Service reports a ban on open fires in all southern Idaho National Forests.

Campfires will be allowed only in designated developed campgrounds. Smoking also is prohibited except in a closed vehicle or building or a developed recreation site.

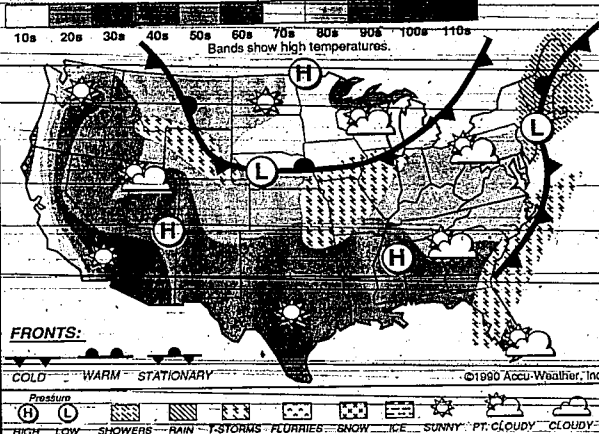

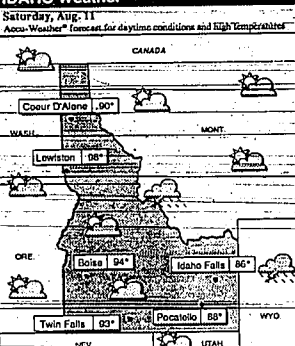

Weather summary
The National Weather Service in Boise provided the following synopsis of Idaho weather:
The hot high pressure system aloft was still centered over the Utah-Columbia border Friday evening. At lower levels, a weak low pressure remained from southern British Columbia to western Mexico. The satellite showed lots of moisture with scattered thunderstorms from the cascades and Sierra Nevada to the western Great Plains. Smoke from forest fires in Idaho and Oregon still plagued southern Idaho. Visibility frequently has been reduced to 5 miles. The smoke and the thunderstorm clouds helped keep temperatures from soaring above 100 degrees.
Rainfall was light again with scattered traces or a few hundredths of an inch. Exceptions were Soldier Mountain northwest of Fairfield where .22 of an inch was measured and Malta with .21 of an inch.
Thunderstorm gusts in the 30 to 35 mph range were observed at Boise and Pocatello during the late afternoon and early evening and at Twin Falls early in the afternoon.
The extended forecast shows slight cooling for the first of the week as a cool low pressure system moves from south of the Aleutians to the Pacific Northwest coast.
The warmest temperature in the state Friday was 100 degrees at Caldwell, Emmet and Parma. Stanley reported the coldest at 47 degrees.
Elsewhere in the nation Friday, the highest temperature was 120 degrees at Death Valley, Calif. The lowest was 37 at Gunnison, Colo.

Heavy rains soak Northeast, cause some flooding

Heavy rains drenched the already saturated Northeast and produced flooding in parts of New Jersey and New York on Friday afternoon and a tornado on New York City's Staten Island uprooted trees and disrupted electrical service.
Flooding closed the Saw Mill River Parkway at Saw Mill and the Bronx River Parkway near White Plains, New York.
There was extensive flooding at Hammonong, N.J., where more than a 4 inches of rain fell Friday morning.
Two gas unions were pulled out of a town where they were protesting when the tornado struck Staten Island, said a spokesman for Brooklyn Gas Co. The utility shut down service along one block to stop leaks, affecting about 50 homes.
Consolidated Edison power lines also were knocked down, said a company spokeswoman. The tornado started

as a watershed over Lower New York Bay.
Flood waters were posted over much of New Hampshire, western portions of both Massachusetts and Rhode Island, eastern New York and the southern half of Vermont.
Rainshowers and thundershowers pelted New England as well as southeastern New York, New Jersey, eastern Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware, eastern Virginia, and parts of the Carolinas.
Showers and storms extended over western Virginia, eastern Kentucky, eastern Tennessee, and from northwest Florida across the Florida peninsula, and scattered over northeast Oklahoma, southeast Kansas, central Missouri, southern Illinois, northwest Iowa, eastern Nebraska, southeastern South Dakota, and southeast California, and from western North Dakota across Montana, northern Idaho and eastern Washington.

Peruvian austerity measures bring looting

LIMA, Peru (AP) — Looting broke out in dozens of poor neighborhoods Friday in an angry reaction to President Alberto Fujimori's harsh austerity program.
In the Villa El Sol shantytown, a mob of more than 2,000 gathered in front of the local

market, demanding that it open. Police used tear gas and clubs to control about 3,000 Peruvians in Lima's Ate-Vite section. The police had been waiting for up to two days for subsidized sugar, but the supply ran out Friday.
Looting began immediately after the government announced an ex-

treme economic austerity program Wednesday night. Gasoline prices jumped from seven cents to more than \$2. The cost of many basic goods tripled or quadrupled.
Telephone, water and electricity rates will rise, as will taxes on the rich. Lower import duties and a free-floating dollar are in store.

"Don't let the enemy pass through the soil of Egypt to use your waters, sons of the Strait of Hormuz. Stop the fleet from moving, sons in Ras al-Khaimah and Sharjah," Saddam said, referring to emirates in the southern gulf.
"The 'soil of Egypt' was a reference to the Suez Canal."

Cole Johnson has worked on more than 200 fires.
"All of them have something memorable," he said.
One fire he remembers for the most interesting was the fire that was unbelievably good, he said.
At another blaze, an air tanker that dumps fire-retardant chemicals on fires crashed on the first day. Johnson went in with the crew that brought out the pilot's body and put out the fire the very next evening.
"It was grim on the first day and it didn't get any better," Johnson said. "Three people were killed on that fire when a crew was overwhelmed by flames."

a practice known as coyote tactics. Sometimes crews cut fire lines all day and lose them the next day, then start all over. And sometimes fires crews work too hard, John said.
Johnson, a graduate of Jerome High School, has worked on fire crews since he started as a seasonal firefighter in 1973.
"It's the only way to change — it's to get on the ground a lot of years," he said. As hotshot superintendent, he was essentially on 24-hour call during the fire season, which normally runs from June 15 to Sept. 15.

of six firefighters each — one chain-saw squad and two regular squads. The makeup of fire crews has changed over the years. In the early 1970s most were white males 19 to 23, college students working for the summer. The average age now is 26 to 27 and many have college degrees.
Dave Clauson of Twin Falls didn't run a fire crew last year but was with the Sawtooth District's seven years. A student of range science at Montana State University, firefighting holds a fascination for Clauson.
"You get to see things others never see. You can see things like full-grown trees bursting into 200-foot towers of flame."

On the other fire helicopters were unable to bring food or supplies to crewed out. Firefighters were forced to spend the night where ever they were at the end of their shifts.
Sweat-soaked Shane Dieckard, sooty face is hunched on the back of the fire engine to which he was assigned. Thunder echoed through the hills, and heavy raindrops fell from the smoky sky, raising billows of dust as they hit the scorched ground.
Dieckard had been on the fire line three days with only about eight hours sleep. His tired eyes reflected apprehension at the thunder. The clouds that brought cooling rain respited him from the glaring sun also brought the added threat of lightning strikes setting other fires.
Tuesday the crews worked through the night. The smoke and darkness adds to the dangers, and the flames become more visible.
"It looks a lot more awesome than it really is," said John Fillmore, incident commander during the initial attack.
Normally firefighters work 12-hour shifts before being relieved. When no-second shift is used, they sometimes when transport to base camp is impractical, they sleep on the ground at the end of their shifts.

Why do they do it? Some do it for adventure, some for the excitement, but most admit they do it for the money. Average pay for a firefighter is \$8,000 to \$10,000 per season. Many of the firefighters are college students and a good fire season can pay for another year of school.
Wednesday night most crews were brought into a base camp set up just outside of Pullman. The base in camp included clean socks, cold drinks and a little shade greeted weary firefighters. Food was brought out from town by the Depot Grill.
"Each on the fire line usually is a lunch lunched ordered to Forest Service specification — a couple of sandwiches, chips, fruit, juice, and a candy bar."
When firefighters can't return to camp or food can't be brought out, they eat "MREs" — meal, ready to eat — the modern equivalent of tinned rations. The meals include an entrée, crackers, jam, peanut butter, powdered juice, instant coffee, sugar, salt and pepper, toilet paper and waterproof matches — instant banquet.

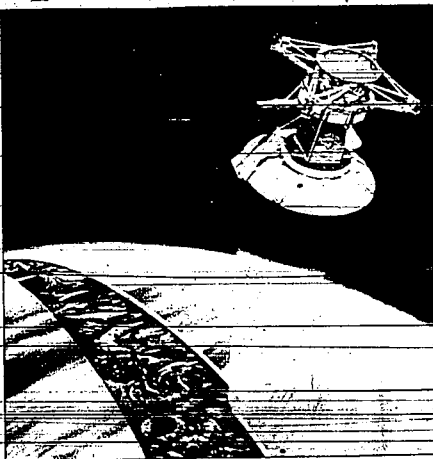

Magellan spacecraft arrives at Venus

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — The Magellan spacecraft plunged over the north pole of Venus, fired its braking rocket and dropped into orbit Friday in NASA's ambitious effort to "unveil" the "landscape" of Earth's perpetually cloudy neighbor planet.



When the spacecraft was behind Venus, out of radio contact with engineers on Earth, Magellan emerged at 12:53 p.m. EDT, but preliminary confirmation that all went well came 13 minutes later because of the time Magellan's radio signal takes to reach Earth.

"Fantastic!" someone yelled over NASA's radio network. "This is the beginning of one of the most exciting eras of planetary exploration," said Lennard Fisk, NASA's associate administrator for space science.

"The plan has been to place an orbiter about every seven years of the solar system, and Magellan is the beginning of that," he said, listing upcoming missions to Jupiter, Mars, Saturn, asteroids and comets.

A minor problem prompted Magellan to switch to a backup gyroscope to point the spacecraft, but that will have no effect on engineers' ability to control Magellan, said Ken Leubetter of Martin Marietta Corp., which built the orbiter.

The NASA contractor's office said the Magellan mission cost \$744 million, including \$415 million for the spacecraft and radar. Other officials cite a \$551 million cost, but that excludes launch from the shuttle and other expenses.

Magellan was the first U.S. planetary spacecraft launched since Pioneer-12 and -13 were sent to Venus in 1978, and also the first launched from a shuttle.

Atlantic pilot Ron Grabe and mission specialist Mark Lee were at Jet Propulsion Laboratory as Magellan reached Venus.

Chrysler fined for tampering with odometers

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Chrysler Corp. was fined \$7.6 million in federal court Friday for selling about 30 previously damaged vehicles as new cars and for odometer violations.

Troops continue buildup; Jordanians turn out to support Saddam

On the ninth day of the Gulf crisis, as Saddam's warlike message flashed from Baghdad through the Middle East, American troops and planes continued to stream into Saudi Arabia to build up their "Desert Shield" against the giant Iraqi army, which invaded and occupied neighboring Kuwait on Aug. 2.

Speaking of the Gulf, Saddam urged Arabs to "burn the soil under their feet."

Earlier Friday, thousands demonstrated in Jordanian cities against America "the Satan" and chanted "Down with Fahd!" — the Saudi monarch who this week invited the U.S. ground forces into his wealthy desert kingdom.

Arab sentiment seemed torn between fear of an Arab usurper, the aggressive Saddam, and resentment of an outside interventionist power, the United States.

Secretary of State James A. Baker III, at NATO headquarters in Belgium on Friday, sought new backing from U.S. allies for the Mideast mili-

itary operation. They offered a few more ships to support a growing U.S. Navy armada that is soon expected to mount a seaborne blockade of Iraq.

Baker also reiterated serious U.S. concerns about the more than 3,500 Americans trapped in Kuwait and Iraq by the Saddam government's sealing of borders.

"We are not calling them hostages," Baker said. But the stranded U.S. citizens were looking more and more like insurance for Saddam, a trump card in his high-stakes showdown with the United States.

After their blitzkrieg into Kuwait, the Iraqis said they were redressing grievances old and new. The Kuwaitis' recent overproduction of oil had deflated world prices and Iraq's oil revenues, they complained, and Kuwait was draining Iraq's strength by demanding repayment of \$15 billion in loans.

They also reasserted old territorial claims over Kuwait and six days after the invasion they "annexed" the small oil state.

Iraq's moves drew worldwide condemnation. The U.N. Security Council ordered a global economic embargo. President Bush said the Iraqi army posed a threat to Saudi Arabia and therefore to the U.S. oil supply and economy — and ordered American troops to reinforce the outnumbered Saudi military.

Iraq's foreign minister, Tariq Aziz, protested to American reporters in Cairo Friday that "we do not threaten anybody."

But Saddam's statement, read by a spokesman on Iraqi radio and Kuwaiti television, struck one beligerent note after another.

After first asserting the United States plans aggression against Iraq, the president threatened various Iraqis in language resonant with the religious enmities of the medieval Crusades.

"Oh, Arabs! Oh, Moslems! Oh, believers in God! wherever you are! This is your day to rise and spread quickly in order to defend Mecca, which is captive to the spears of the Americans and the Zionists," Saddam proclaimed.

Liberian rebels launch new attempt on Doe

MONROVIA, Liberia (AP) — Rebels launched another offensive today in a bid to take President Samuel Doe's troops before a West African force intervenes to halt the brutal, 7-month-old civil war.

The rebels loyal to Charles Taylor broke through government lines Wednesday night and reached the eastern edge of the capital. Another advance began today, reporters traveling with the rebels said.

In recent weeks, Doe's forces in the capital have battled fighters of a rival rebel soldier led by Prince Johnson. Before Wednesday, Doe's forces had held Taylor's soldiers in a position east of Monrovia.

Meanwhile, neighboring West African countries today prepared to send troops in to halt the civil war.

Newspaper reports in Lagos, Nigeria, said planes carrying 500 Nigerian soldiers might be sent to Liberia as Sunday. Residents of Freetown, Sierra Leone, said they saw Nigerian naval vessels preparing to leave for Monrovia.

No official information was available on the timetable for the

intervention by five West African nations, but reports that rebels had attacked the embassies of two of the countries were certain to speed the action.

Doe and Johnson have welcomed the West African initiative, but Taylor is opposed.

He fears Nigerian participation because the Nigerian president, Gen. Ibrahim Babangida, has been an ally of Doe.

A Doe spokesman, meanwhile, accused U.S. Marines of shooting at the Liberian president Thursday, but the State Department in Washington denied it.

A close adviser to the president was hospitalized with chest and neck wounds after the attack in which the Marines allegedly shot at Doe from a helicopter, said Selly Thompson, a spokesman for Doe. He spoke in an interview with the British Broadcasting Corp.

In Rome, a U.S. agency said it would send \$16 million in military aid to help feed about 400,000 people — uprooted by Liberia's war.

The food will be shipped to Liberia and the neighboring Ivory Coast, Guinea and Sierra Leone, where tens of thousands of Liberians have taken refuge.

Soldiers seek to restore order in S. Africa towns

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — Armed soldiers, riot police and ANC marshals marched through mixed-race townships of Port Elizabeth on Friday to restore order after 42 people died in four days of rioting and looting.

"It would appear the situation is under control, but we cannot say if it will flare up again or what is going to happen," said Maj. Bill Dennis, a police spokesman in the southeastern coastal city.

He said sporadic incidents of arson, looting and stone-throwing continued Friday although it was "much quieter."

Police Lt. Gen. Mulder van Eyck said security forces were in control of much of the area, where violence erupted Monday after a following local meeting to protest rent increases and the educational system.

Police said 42 people were killed in fighting which spread Thursday night to townships around the city of

Uitenhage, 15 miles inland from Port Elizabeth. Some were killed by police gunfire, but there was no breakdown on how many they said.

Police said 220 people were arrested for looting, plundering and burning since Monday.

Telephone, trash collection, mail and all other public services were out of the riot-hit areas.

Municipal employees had been targeted for attack and, along with most other residents, stayed home to protect their houses.

The government had appealed to Port Elizabeth residents to stop the unrest. The African National Congress held a community meeting and urged people to stay off the streets.

Van Eyck said residents told him the unrest was sparked by the "high rental of homes, the lack of proper water supply, lack of facilities and the inadequate schools."

NATO allies endorse U.S. moves in Mideast

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — NATO allies on Friday unanimously approved U.S. military action to guard the Persian Gulf against further Iraqi aggression but cleared clear of taking collective action themselves.

Two of the allies — Canada and Belgium — prepared to announce their own contributions to the land force and sea armada organized by the United States in defense of Saudi Arabia's oilfields. And West Germany sent four ships to the Eastern Mediterranean.

However, Manfred Woerner, the NATO secretary-general, announced after a four-hour closed meeting with Secretary of State James A. Baker III and 15 other Western foreign ministers "Military action by NATO as such is restricted to its area of military competence."

Baker, in a separate news conference, said the United States, Britain and other nations that have sent forces to the region will have to coordinate their operations.

If there should be a naval blockade, for example, "there will have to be a traffic cop," Baker said. "Some

one or some collection of countries or individuals will have to coordinate this. That is something that is being considered and being discussed."

Baker headed back to the United States after the meeting in Brussels. He will meet with President Bush Saturday at the president's vacation home in Kennebunkport, Maine, to report on his trip, which also included a stop in Turkey.

Woerner said the allies by "full consensus" had endorsed President Bush's military moves in the Persian Gulf and sanctions against Iraq approved by the U.N. Security Council. And they pledged to defend Turkey if attacked by neighboring Iraq-Turkey on Thursday, informed attacks from Turkish bases against Iraq in the event of war.

Baker said Friday at NATO headquarters that the allies had agreed with "unmistakable resolve and solidarity."

He noted that Great Britain and France already have announced the deployment of forces; and said Germany, Belgium and Canada gave

indications they will have announcements to make in due course.

Later Friday, Canadian Prime Minister Brian Mulroney said his nation will send three ships and 200 sailors as its contribution to a multinational force.

A U.S. official traveling with Baker, commenting only on condition of anonymity, said, "You will see other allied forces, some of which will be on the ground" in the Mideast.

Baker had told the foreign ministers at their closed session that Iraqi President Saddam Hussein is a dictator engaged in an unrelenting buildup of missiles and chemical weapons "far out of proportion to any conceivable threat."

Asked at the news conference if he was calling for Saddam's overthrow, Baker said he was not going to suggest the United States was pursuing such a goal.

"That's a matter for the people of Iraq to determine; that is, who will constitute their leadership," Baker said. "But I am suggesting that the entire world community has risen up in almost complete unity to condemn the aggression that has taken

place by Iraq under the leadership of Saddam Hussein."

Baker went on to condemn as "beyond all international norms" Iraq's seizure of some 500 Americans and thousands of other foreigners to leave the country and Iraq hold Kuwait.

"The United States is very disturbed about the restrictions on the freedom of travel," Baker said. "He said most if not all foreigners are being prevented from leaving Iraq and Kuwait against their will, he said.

However, Baker said, since no demand had been made in exchange for their freedom, we are not calling them hostages." Nor, he said, had they been mistreated "as best we can tell."

He said diplomatic contacts were continuing in an effort to secure their freedom. Baker lauded Spain, Italy and Portugal for letting the actions in the Persian Gulf.

He pointed out that the NATO charter "precludes the allies as a group from taking military action in the Gulf."

Travelers report beatings, looting by Iraqis in Kuwait

MANAMA, Bahrain (AP) — Some Iraqi soldiers in Kuwait beat and looted stores, while others were apologetic about their neighbor's invasion of its tiny oil-rich neighbor, travelers reaching Bahrain said.

Resistance to the invasion has dwindled but there are still scattered demonstrations in support of the deposed Kuwaiti emir and against Iraqi President Saddam Hussein, the travelers said Thursday.

In addition, Iraqis in Kuwait have staged demonstrations in support of Saddam. An unspecified number of women with Iraqi accents shouted pro-Saddam slogans, one traveler said.

For the most part, however, an eerie silence prevails, punctuated only by the sound of gunshots. Iraqi soldiers squat and sleep on the pavements of the near-deserted streets, they said on condition of anonymity.

Kuwait businessman Mohsen al-Ajmi, 28, said he participated in garbage clearing and maintenance operations to help out housewives

whose husbands were stranded outside Kuwait when Iraq invaded the country on Aug. 2.

Al-Ajmi said that at one point he and others participating in the operations were stopped for questioning by Iraqi soldiers.

"They did not search us. In fact, they apologized and cursed Saddam. One of them said 'Why are we here? We have been hurting in this heat, while Saddam sits in his air-conditioned palace,'" al-Ajmi said.

He said that as he was being questioned by the Iraqis, two Egyptian workers passed by. The soldiers called out to the men, asking them to produce identity cards.

"Then said: 'Egyptians? You don't deserve to live.'"

"They beat the two Egyptians so savagely that we implored them to stop," said al-Ajmi. "They let the Egyptians go. They were hurt quite badly."

In London, one traveler reported the rape by an Iraqi soldier of a

woman on a British Airways flight that was stranded in Kuwait by the Iraqi invasion. Her nationality was not immediately clear.

Jamal Alsane, managing director of the Regency Palace Hotel in Kuwait City, said the woman was attacked on a bus as the passengers and crew of Flight 149 were being transferred from one hotel to another.

Speaking at the Kuwait Embassy in London, he said a Lebanese crew member pleaded with the soldier to show the woman mercy.

"The soldier took his gun and said, 'One move and I blow you up.' The other soldiers laughed, Alsane said.

Travelers reaching Bahrain said Iraqi soldiers often knocked on doors to ask for cold water, and

sometimes food — mainly beer and fruit. But others said Iraqi soldiers forced Kuwaitis to provide them with water and fruit.

In the sweltering summer heat "profusely sweating Iraqis soldiers look tired and, I would say, ashamed of themselves," said 26-year-old Kuwaiti, Youssuf al-Rashidi.

"A number of Iraqi soldiers came to us and tried to calm us down, saying 'we will do you no harm ... we have nothing against you ... we only carry out orders,'" al-Rashidi said at the Diplomat Hotel in Bahrain.

But al-Rashidi's four companions had different stories to tell.

"I saw Iraqi soldiers heap in tonnes sacks of money and bits of furniture stolen from the Gulf Bank, one of the four said on condition of anonymity."

Bush warns Iraq to hold tankers

The Washington Post

KENNEDYPORT, Maine — President Bush, embarking Friday on a 25-day vacation here at his oceanfront home, issued a stern warning to Iraq not to send out tankers loaded with oil in an effort to break the international trade embargo.

The president refused to call the growing buildup of naval forces in the Persian Gulf and elsewhere in the Middle East a belligerent but said he remains prepared to "do whatever is necessary to see that exports from Iraq do not go forward."

Asked if U.S. ships would stop Iraqi tankers, he replied, "Put it this way: I would advise Iraqi ships not

to go out with oil," adding that "there are a lot of things going on right now that I don't feel like commenting on."

Speaking just before a majority of Arab nations, meeting at a summit in Cairo, voted to send troops to Saudi Arabia in an effort to prevent an Iraqi invasion, Bush bashed aside Iraqi President Saddam Hussein's call for a jihad, or holy war, as the "frantic ploy" of a radical leader who has been "backed into the corner" by world opinion.

"He is so isolated in the world, so backed into a corner by world opinion, which is almost 100 percent against him, that he has to find some mechanism to rally support," Bush said aboard Air Force One.

Barry convicted on 1 drug charge

WASHINGTON (AP) — Mayor Marion Barry was convicted Friday on a single drug charge and acquitted on another. The judge declared a mistrial on 12 counts, including more serious perjury charges, after jurors reported they were deadlocked.

The outcome was a stunning end to a six-week trial that featured an FBI videotape of the mayor smoking crack cocaine in a sting operation.

Barry, who sat stonefaced when the single guilty verdict was announced, smiled broadly as U.S.



Barry turned and hugged his press secretary and a supporter.

District Judge Thomas P. Jackson declared the mistrial. He turned to his attorney R. Kenneth Mundy, charged his November 1989 will, long-time associate Doris Crenshaw. Crenshaw testified that she snorted cocaine with the mayor in her hotel room.

Barry was found innocent of charges that he possessed cocaine on Sept. 7, 1989.

Campeau ousted from retailing

NEW YORK (AP) — Robert Campeau, the flamboyant Canadian retailer whose empire tumbled under the weight of debt, was ousted Friday as chairman and chief executive of his own company.

The Campeau Corp.'s board made the announcement in a terse statement from its Toronto headquarters. Campeau remains a director of the company but his future remains unclear.

Campeau is an entrepreneur who went on a multibillion-dollar spending spree for American department stores in the 1980s using borrowed money, expanding his holdings to well-known names ranging from Jordan Marsh to Bloomingdale's.

But his U.S. retailing operations staggered under the weight of this debt, and sought Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection last January.

He has faced further pressure because of additional debts, which include millions of dollars in personal loans, and the declining value of the stock in his own company.

Rumors had circulated recently that Campeau was in danger of losing his position as chairman and was in fact under pressure to resign.

Campeau's board appointed James D. Raymond, a director of the National Bank of Canada, and Gary M. Goodman, a top executive of Olympia & York Developments Ltd. of Toronto, to the office of chief executive on an interim basis.

The board also named Robert Despres, a Canadian investor who has been on Campeau's board since 1975, as interim chairman of the company.

Strike to close more GM plants

DETROIT (AP) — General Motors Corp. said Friday that a strike by parts plant workers angry at use of outside parts sources would halt several assembly lines from Michigan to Louisiana, idling nearly 15,000 workers.

United Auto Workers officials said the strike by 2,700 employees in Flint, Mich., is serious in its opposition to so-called "outsourcing" of parts and in its demand for job security in its national contract talks with the Big Three automakers.

Negotiations on contracts to replace those that expire Sept. 14 began last month.

Workers at the AC Rochester Flint West plant walked out Wednesday over complaints about being assigned more work in the same hours, health and safety grievances and plans to transfer as many as 900 jobs to independent shops and other GM plants.

The plant makes about 65 percent of the fuel tanks for GM cars and trucks, along with other parts such as doors for vans and grilles for vans and pickups.

To avoid storing large stocks of expensive parts, GM plants rely on just-in-time delivery from parts plants like Flint West, so the effect of a strike spreads quickly.

Documents show plan to blow canal

MIAMI (AP) — Manuel Noriega drew up plans during the 1970s to sabotage the Panama Canal and attack U.S. military headquarters to guarantee compliance with the treaty giving the waterway to Panama, according to confiscated documents.

Notes by Noriega on the plan, portions of which are printed in the September issue of a New York-based Details magazine, were found during last year's U.S. invasion. The files are currently in a warehouse, guarded by the U.S. Army in Corozal, Panama.

The documents indicate Noriega was behind a series of small explosions in the old U.S.-controlled Canal Zone during 1976, when Panama was trying to hasten negotiations with the United States over the canal.

During the 1970s, Noriega was a rising officer in the Panamanian military intelligence service. Panama's then leader, Gen. Omar Torrijos, was killed in 1981 in a plane crash and Noriega eventually took control of the military and de facto control of the country.

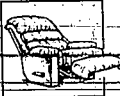
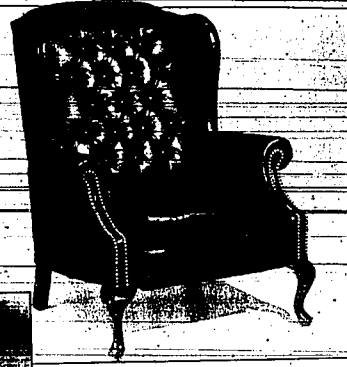

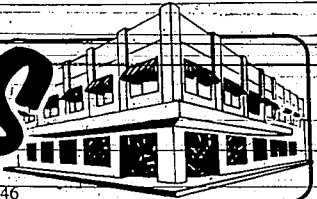

Oakland continues near-total domination of New York

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Dave Stewart won his fifth straight game with a three-hitter over 8 2-3 innings and the Oakland Athletics shut out New York for the fourth time in seven meetings with a 3-0 victory Friday night that ended the Yankees' longest winning streak of the year at five games.

Stewart's six-pitcher home run in the fourth inning and Terry Steinbach had a two-run single in the fifth as the A's ran their record against the Yankees to 7-0.

After Kevin Maas singled and Jesse Barfield walked with none out in the second inning, Stewart (16-8) retired the next 17 batters — one hit into a double play — before walking Jesse Barfield to lead off the eighth.

He hasn't given up an earned run in 30 2-3 innings in his seven meetings, Oakland pitchers have limited the Yankees to four runs and 36 hits for a .158 batting average in 65 innings.

The A's improved the best record in baseball to 71-42 and moved 29 games over 500 for the first time this season. But they lost one-half to the Chicago White Sox, who swept a doubleheader over Texas and trail by 3 1/2 games in the American League West.

Stewart, who struck out eight and walked three in lowering his ERA to 2.46, is 5-0 in six starts since his last loss July 13 to Milwaukee. Rick Honeycutt got the last out by fanning Mel Hall with two runners on base for his fifth save.

Steinbach scored the game's first run in the fourth when he was hit by a pitch from loser Dave LaPoint (6-8), took second on a walk in Mark McGwire and scored on Weiser's two-out single. Right fielder Barfield had an easy out at the plate but threw the ball over catcher Brian Dorsett's head.

Carney Lansford singled to lead off the Oakland fifth, Willie Randolph reached on a bunt single and Dave Henderson walked one out later to load the bases for Steinbach's single. Steinbach is 7-for-12 with 15 RBIs in bases-loaded situations this season.

American League

McMurry, making his first start since July 5, 1986, with Atlanta, is 0-10 in 17 starts since defeating Houston on Sept. 3, 1984. He gave up all the Chicago runs and five hits in 4 2-3 innings.

McDowell (8-6) gave up seven hits, including a run-scoring double to Jack Daugherty in the second inning. Texas scored its second run off Barry Jones in the ninth on Pete Incaviglia's RBI single before Bobby Thigpen got the last two outs for his 37th save.

Mariners 4, Red Sox 1

SEATTLE (AP) — Ken Griffey Jr. had four hits and Randy Johnson pitched a four-hitter over eight-plus innings to break a personal four-game losing streak as the Seattle Mariners beat the Boston Red Sox 4-1 Friday night.

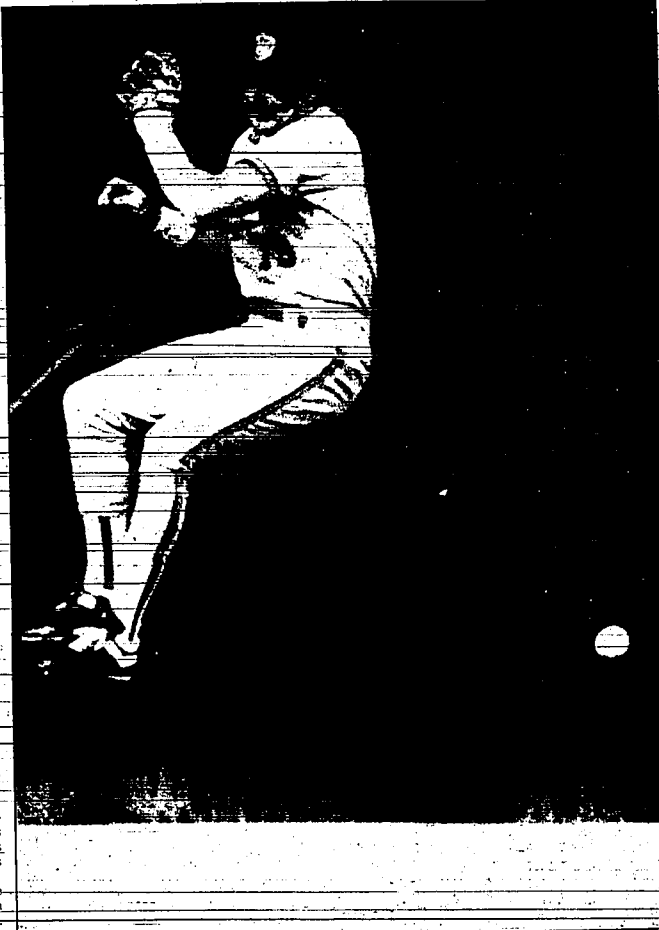

Cassia economy stronger than numbers show

BURLEY — In Burley and Rupert, high prices for potatoes bring on the good times. But don't expect all the economic indicators to buck that up.

The Mini-Cassia area is prone to high unemployment rates no matter how much a spud costs. The labor force here is still heavily dependent on agriculture and food processing, and the unemployment rate soars when one of the big plants shuts down for maintenance.

The area's economy isn't in a slump by any means, even though the latest unemployment figures show a 12.5 percent rate in Cassia County and a 12.2 percent rate in Minidoka County.

So the recent unemployment jumps — the Minidoka and Cassia counties had rates of between 7.2 percent and 9 percent in June — are expected. They still cause problems.

"We have a pretty large population here," said Bill Schaefer, the Burley Area Chamber of Commerce's executive director. "When a good percentage of those are unemployed in the summer, it's got to have an impact."

The Mini-Cassia economy is a riddle, affected by two forces revolving around agriculture: crop prices and food processing. The result is a cyclical economy dependent on food-processing layoffs and crop prices.

"We have virtually no industry that isn't related to agriculture," Burley Job Service

It is basic but necessary maintenance, designed to keep the road surface in good condition and provide skid protection.

The expected date of completion for this project is Oct. 1. The seal coating will be started by Aug. 1, 1991. A starting date will be set once the contract is awarded.

Minidoka commissioners consider new tax district

RUPERT — Minidoka County Commissioners are expected to decide Monday whether to initiate a new taxing district to support Minidoka Memorial Hospital's ambulance service.

Randy Holom, acting Administrator at the hospital, said the Hospital Board sponsored a petition-drive requesting the levy, and obtained 85 signatures in favor of the measure in only a couple days.

The board has presented the petition to the commissioners and the commissioners are expected to reach a decision at their Monday meeting. The measure is not required to go before the voters.

Holom said the request was sparked by "consistent losses of \$24,000 to \$35,000 per year" from the service.

He said that the commissioners purchased the ambulance service from a private individual five or six years ago, they agreed the county would pay \$1,200 a month to maintain the service. The commissioners also agreed to increase that fee if expenses deemed it necessary.

However, Holom said, the county hasn't been able to meet that need and, therefore, the service has been losing money.

The new taxing district, if approved, would be county-wide and would most likely take effect with tax notices sent out this November, County Clerk Duane Smith said.

County residents currently pay a levy for the hospital at the rate of 33.9 cents per \$1,000 of the assessed value of taxable property.

Smith said residents would see up to 40 cents per \$1,000 of the assessed value of their taxable property added to their bill this fall if an ambulance service levy passes muster.

Most districts would have to be voted by the people, this one does not," said Smith. And if this tax district is formed, "the county commissioners would be the governing body," able to lower or raise the tax rate.

At least one County Commissioner, however, Lyle Barton, would like to see voters have a chance to voice their opinions on the issue at the polls.

Holom said he and Cassia Memorial Hospital administrators, along with ambulance directors and nursing representatives from both hospitals, have met to discuss a joint two-county ambulance service that could be centrally located in Heyburn.

Holom said Cassia Hospital officials "did not shoot down the idea," but had concerns. "It's speculation, I have not been able to look at all the figures yet," Holom said. "It would not be a benefit, we would still show losses and the county would still have to subsidize, based on what I've heard."

One major concern, he said, is that combining to one service moves Minidoka County's northern edge another 10 minutes away in response time.

Time lapse is an important factor, Holom said. "If an advanced unit is not on the scene, even if CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) is started, the patient's chance is next to nothing."

When questioned about Quick-Response Units, Holom said he is "not against them. Please see AMBULANCE/B2

Blaine P&Z OKs setbacks on streams

HAILEY — As a means to protect fragile river environments, future homeowners in Blaine County may have to refrain from building closer than 100 feet from river's edge.

After a public hearing Thursday night, the Blaine County Planning and Zoning Commission approved adoption of a zoning amendment that outlines minimum setback requirements for buildings and decks and outlines management practices regarding the riparian habitat that lines the river banks.

Currently Blaine County has no ordinances guidelines for such setbacks or riparian management.

The new ordinance would apply to all property along the Big Wood River, the Little Wood River, the Salmon River and all tributaries for all perennial streams, including East Fork and Silver Creeks.

The ordinance came about at the request of the County Commissioners as a means to protect the river, protect homeowners from flooding and to provide a scenic setback for river users.

Some homes have been built as close as 25 to 30 feet from the Big Wood River. Many homeowners have stripped the native brush from the banks, leaving them susceptible to erosion and flooding, and creating a distraction from the aesthetic enjoyment of the river environment.

"I don't think there's anything more gross than to come around a bend and see a two-story house with a deck sticking out when you're trying fish," said Doug Bury of Friends of the Bigwood.

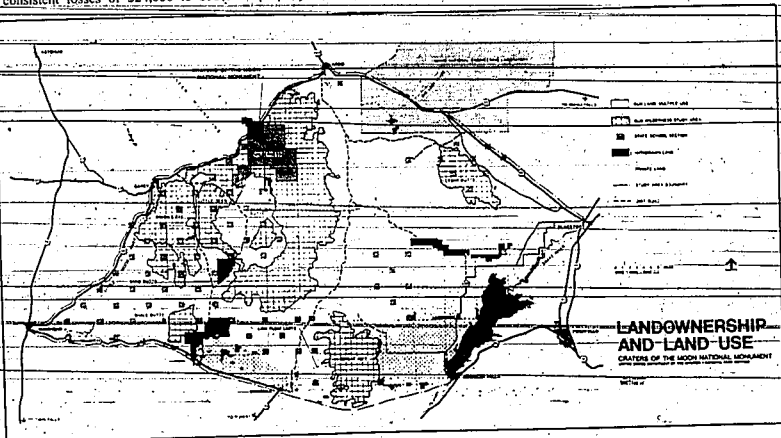
The ordinance, if approved by the Blaine County Commission, would require a 100-foot setback from the high-water mark for construction of any kind.

In addition, the first 50 feet of land from the high water mark would be designated as a riparian setback.

Landscaping would be allowed within the riparian setback only if it "will not destroy, reduce, impair or otherwise adversely impact the remaining native riparian vegetation," and if "only native plant species were inherent wildlife values and stabilizing characteristics (i.e., dense root systems) are used."

The ordinance received much public support, with several supporters proclaiming the benefit of the riparian zone in curbing the need to riprap the river banks in event of flooding.

Craters park plan turns into headache for Stallings as 1990 election draws near

TWIN FALLS — A proposal to turn the Craters of the Moon National Monument into a national park has turned into an election-year headache for Idaho Rep. Richard Stallings.

Last November, the Democratic congressman introduced legislation in Congress to give Idaho its first national park. The bill designated 375,000 acres in the southeastern Idaho as the Craters of the Moon National Park and 125,000 acres as the Great Rift Reserve.

In addition to preserving the geologically significant lava beds, a national park would help bring tourist dollars into Idaho, Stallings said.

The plan enjoys the backing of a number of Chamber of Commerce groups from Burley to Idaho Falls. In fact, it seemed that everybody liked idea, at least at first.

But as the 1990 election draws near, a number of Idahoans are saying thanks for thinking of us, but the Craters of the Moon National Park is one gift from Washington the state doesn't want.

In an interview Friday, Stallings' Republican challenger Sean McDevitt said he's not opposed to designating the current 53,000-acre monument as a national park, but he's against spreading that designation

across a half million acres.

Representatives for the Idaho Department of Fish and Game and the Idaho Cattlemen Association have joined McDevitt in publicly denouncing the plan. A new group calling itself "Idaho Sportsmen and Ranchers United" has organized more than 3,000 people who are opposed to the park designation because they believe it could hamper grazing and mean an end to hunting, trapping and other recreational activities in the area.

"It would be best for everyone to put this to rest for the remainder of the campaign," he said, adding that there are Republicans on the committee who support the proposal, but don't want to get involved in the election-year fray.

"This isn't a question of partisan politics," McDevitt said. "This is a question of what's right for Idaho. There is very little support for it in the state. It's contrary to the wishes of the people of Idaho — it's just wrong."

Stallings isn't about to abandon the proposal. He said he'll use the delay to refine the park plan in order to satisfy concerns within his 2nd District.

For one thing, he will not fly at high altitudes without an oxygen bottle. He said a shortage of oxygen led to his main error: he lost his course and forced him to make an emergency landing at the federal atomic site.

Zumstein also will take it easier, saying fatigue was another factor in "violating the rules because I thought I was man enough to do it," he said Thursday.

Zumstein noticed he was flying directly over the city on a course that would take him not to Twin Falls, but to San Francisco.

Zumstein then tried to steer his plane back on course, but did not look at a map. He was unaware hypoxia, a shortage of oxygen to his brain, already was affecting his judgment.

By comparison, the rest of the Zumsteins' trip was uneventful. After landing at the site, the family was driven back to town and taken to dinner by an INEL employee that night.

FORT HALL, Idaho (AP)—While 160 Shoshone-Bannock firefighters stand ready to be called to fight fires, the Indian crews do not work as far away as Tennessee, the Indian crews contend.

THE ACES ON BRIDGE BOBBY WOLFF

East must act quickly and decisively to beat the defense's four-spade game. Look over the entire layout to see if you can spot the unusual defense to get the fourth defensive winner.

After East wins the heart ace, a routine defense results in a trick for South. The defenders get only two spades and a heart, and this hand goes into the file of missed opportunities.

What must East lead at trick two to beat the game? Only an imaginative East will find the answer. He must lead a club into the jaws of dummy's A-Q.

Dummy's queen wins, a trump goes to West's king, and West leads a club to dummy's ace. East wins the next trump to lead a third round of clubs, and the ensuing ruff wins one diamond.

Will a diamond shift at trick two also succeed? Although more dramatic, it won't be as effective. When East leads a third round of diamonds, South can ruff. West can't score his small trump, and South still makes 11 tricks.

It pays to stay alert. Sometimes the least appealing defensive play holds the key to success.

Peaceful weekend in park goes up in smoke

YOSEMITE NATIONAL PARK — Tourists anticipating a vacation weekend in majestic Yosemite National Park saw their plans go up in smoke Friday as lightning-sparked fires ravaged thousands of acres.

An estimated 10,000 people were held inside the park overnight because of the fire. They were escorted out Friday morning, some just ended their travels early and headed home and others headed elsewhere.

Norbert and Edith Eisler of Mission Viejo, Calif., had planned to spend two days in Yosemite, which is observing its 100th birthday this year, but they decided to move on to Sequoia National Park, 170 miles to the south.

"I'm a lot disappointed because I read a chapter about it in my social studies book," said their 10-year-old daughter, Lori. "The teacher told me to go up and see it. Now, I can't see it."

Her father promised to drive the 100 miles from Los Angeles back to the park again, "hopefully next year."

Fires triggered by more than 24,000 lightning strikes during the week burned more than 100,000 acres across California, including 12,000 acres and 28 structures in Yosemite by Friday. A fire in northern California's Tehama County had burned 39,000 acres and one in the Sequoia National Park affected 17,000.

Fires also raged in parts of Idaho, Oregon, Montana, Nevada, Utah and Washington state. Nearly 16,000 lightning strikes were reported in the Western states in 24 hours, according to the Boise Intermountain Fire Center in Idaho, which coordinates fire control efforts. The center said 19,000 firefighters were at work in the West.

Three villages in the Yosemite area were evacuated at various times, and 28 structures burned in the Sacred River Canyon. Most of the structures were probably summer cabins, said Lisa Boyd, spokeswoman at the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection.

Firefighters spare 3 towns from forest fire

BURNS, Ore. (AP) — A fire command official credited a savvy federal scout for holding a 737-700-acre fire three miles from the southeastern Oregon towns of Burns and Hines until the wind shifted.

"The Bureau of Land Management did a great scouting near Burns in assessing where the problems might be in this area and helped set up a strategy for guarding the area — and it worked," the information officer Don Jackson said Friday.

The line crews were short of equipment and manpower.

"When you have a limited amount of resources, you have to put them in the most strategic places. They put lines in the right places, put people in the right places and those turned out to be the trouble spots and it held the fire off," Jackson said. "We were impressed."

Jackson said 15 individual fires in the area, collectively known as the Pine Springs Basin Complex, had burned together and covered 73,700 acres.

There were 969 people battling the fires Friday morning, but the number was expected to reach 1,300 by evening, Jackson said.

The fire had burned to within one mile of the town of Riley and within three miles northwest of Burns, a town of about 3,000, and its southern neighbor, Hines, a town of about 1,500, officials said.

The few residents of Riley were evacuated Wednesday night.

"Burns is still prepared for an immediate evacuation, but for the moment it doesn't appear to be necessary," Jackson said. He cautioned, however, wind shifts are unpredictable.

"With typical weather, I'd say yes, it's very possible — it did happen last night."

Evacuation plans remained in place Friday in case fire conditions change, spokesman of the Oregon Multiple Agency Center said in Salem.

The spokesman said 250-500 member battalions from the U.S. Army 31st Division were scheduled to arrive in Burns this weekend to help battle the fire.

ICA chief says organization will remain activist

LEWISTON (AP) — If Idaho Cattle Association President Bert Brackett has his way, Republican Gary Glenn's successor as the group's executive vice president will be just like Glenn.

The search is on for a replacement for Glenn, who-Ada County Republican officials have named to an unopposed spot on the November ballot for county commissioner. Barring a successful write-in challenge, he will take over that job in January.

Republican turns tables over gas issue

LEWISTON (AP) — Democratic congressional candidate Larry LaRocco has no room to complain about opponent Skip Smyser's campaign donations from oil companies because he owned Exxon corporate bonds, the Parma Republican says.

"He has financially padded his own personal pocket and to criticize the contributions of companies he has personally invested in is silly," Smyser said Thursday.

Earlier this week, LaRocco blasted Smyser for taking \$2,000 in oil company campaign contributions and then keeping quiet about the rising price of motor fuel at the pump. Latah decides against joint operation

MOSCOW (AP) — Latah County has agreed to participate in a regional juvenile detention center in Lewiston, but will pay a daily rate to house its young offenders there rather than half the cost of operating the facility.

With Chairman Thomas Johansen absent, Commissioners Dana Magnus and Chairman Nancy Spangley voted Thursday night to opt out of months of uncertainty about Latah County's involvement in the regional center.

County commissioners indicated they were leaning toward paying a daily rate for housing the county's juvenile offenders at the detention center because the county could not afford to split \$420,000 in annual operating costs of a 16-bed facility with Nez Perce County, but remained undecided.

WSU, U of I set for record enrollments

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) — Counter to predictions of declining college attendance nationwide, officials at Washington State University and the University of Idaho expect record enrollments this fall.

WSU Admissions Director Terry Flynn said as many as 17,200 students could be at the Pullman campus for classes Aug. 27. The school's record enrollment, 17,468, was set in 1980.

ICA chief says organization will remain activist

LEWISTON (AP) — If Idaho Cattle Association President Bert Brackett has his way, Republican Gary Glenn's successor as the group's executive vice president will be just like Glenn.

The search is on for a replacement for Glenn, who-Ada County Republican officials have named to an unopposed spot on the November ballot for county commissioner. Barring a successful write-in challenge, he will take over that job in January.

"I guess some alternatives that I view, one is a higher profile, activist type that would conduct the affairs of the association in that manner, versus a low-profile, quiet, behind-the-scenes operation," Brackett said Thursday. "And basically, we're going to go with the higher-profile, more activist approach to things."

Glenn is best known as leader of Idaho's right-to-work movement. In 1986, it succeeded in winning voter approval for an initiative outlawing union membership or payment of union dues as a condition of employment.

Since then, Glenn has maintained a two-year high profile in more than 100 days of day-to-day operations and serving as its political lightning rod.

"There's no doubt the new person that we will get will be compared to Gary," Brackett said. "Gary's smart. He's a good administrator. He's pretty good at government affairs, state and federal agencies. He's got pretty good political sense about him. Those are all qualities that are real important to us."

Convicts may carry weapons within Idaho

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP) — Murderers and other convicted felons in Idaho may carry guns after their release despite a federal law to bar the practice, the Ninth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals has ruled.

"The restrictions that existed before this, which were intended to keep guns away from untrustworthy, potentially bad people, now aren't there," said Kim Lindquist, assistant U.S. Attorney in Boise.

Sitting in Seattle, the court ruled Wednesday the federal statute prohibiting felons from carrying firearms does not apply in states such as Idaho which restore their civil rights once they have served their sentence.

The U.S. Justice Department will consider appealing the case to the U.S. Supreme Court, Lindquist said.

'Quantum Leap' is favorite TV show, at least according to the 'Leapheads'

As if the proliferation of "Trekkies" devoted to "Star Trek" memorabilia weren't alarming enough, NBC now alerts us to a new phenomenon that threatens to retard the social development of TV viewers: the "Leapheads."

Now, to you and us the term "Leapheads" might most accurately describe an acne condition. But NBC insists that it instead refers to colonies across the nation that meet weekly to discuss and analyze their favorite TV show, which turns out to be none other than that network's very own "Quantum Leap." It's an interesting development for a show that once seemed more likely to sink into oblivion than to develop a fanatical following.

"Quantum Leap" premiered as a midseason replacement on NBC in March 1989 — and immediately landed in deep ratings trouble. The problem seemed to be that the idea of the series was unusually complex for a network show: A young scientist (Scott Bakula), following a botched experiment, is doomed to "leap" into the bodies and lives of people he has never met — ranging from a young female secretary to a mentally impaired dock worker to a young sailor with a Japanese bride — across a time frame between the mid-1950s and mid-1970s. On top of that, he is transported into these new existences for reasons only known — or guessed at — by a faulty computer named "Ziggy." And on top of that, Sam's requisite sidekick, Albert (Dean Stockwell), isn't even human, per se: He's a

hologram, an invention that many viewers hadn't even heard of. By the time you mixed in all the "rules" associated with the leaps — e.g., only Sam, animals and children under the age of 5 can see or hear Albert — the series would seem to be one that would strain the memory banks of a Ziggy.

But complexity is the mother of cult shows. Despite its discouraging start in the ratings, "Quantum Leap" was developing a base of avid viewers on which it could build for the future. Besides, you didn't have to be a "Leaphead" to enjoy the show, although it did help to tune it in a few times to get comfortable with the concept.

But that in itself was becoming a challenge. An alarmed NBC was doing some pretty fancy leaping of its own, skipping "Quantum Leap"

all over the schedule in a fashion that made it all but unfindable to most viewers.

Thankfully, last fall things began to settle down. NBC anchored "Quantum Leap" on Wednesdays, and viewers began to come around until, by the end of the season, the series was regularly outpointing in the Nielsen's the two other cult shows scheduled opposite it: ABC's "China Beach" and CBS's "Wiseguy." True to the show itself, the story had a happy ending. "Quantum Leap" is on the upcoming NBC schedule, slated on Fridays opposite ABC's "20/20" and CBS's doddering "Dallas."

Staff mounts media blitz campaign to put 'Roseanne' back on top of ratings

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "Roseanne" fell from first to third in national ratings for one of the least-watched weeks in television history after its namesake star mangled the national anthem.

NBC's "Cheers" finished in first place and CBS' "60 Minutes" claimed second for the week that ended Sunday, according to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

With viewership down to one of the lowest ever numbers, the repeat of "Roseanne" was in a five-way tie for third place with a 13.0 rating compared to 14.6 for the July 31 show.

About 1.4 million fewer households tuned in to "Roseanne" last week than the previous week. "Repeats don't matter," Miss Barr's husband, Tom Arnold, said Tuesday. "It's hard to gauge. It doesn't mean much."

Miss Barr delivered a screeching version of the national anthem Aug. 1 at San Diego's Jack Murphy stadium before the second game of a baseball doubleheader.

It was pilloried, but Miss Barr and Arnold launched a media blitz to combat the bad press.

Viewers will either love or loathe him

Thinking back on two weeks in Hollywood spent previewing the fall TV season, I've decided there are two kinds of people in television: Those who hold press conferences, and those who hold press conferences hostage.

Among those in the second category are Ted Turner, whose swashbuckling charm made the assembled critics hostages (as usual), and Jane Pauley, whose interminable maundering had us fantasizing about the old show biz hook.

But in two weeks no one held a press conference hostage with quite the same lock-the-door-and-throw-away-the-key finality as Lenny

Clarke. Remember that name. By November you'll either love Lenny Clarke or loathe him. Ditto the new CBS comedy he stars in, "Lenny," about a working-class loudmouth in South Boston.

Try to imagine Roseanne Barr with testosterone. At one point in the press conference, Clarke, a burly guy with tall, bushy hair — a greaser's cut without the grease — was actually shouting at the critics. "I am not going back to the nightclub! I'm sorry! This show is not going to fail!" Not for lack of volume, certainly. Lack of good scripts, however, could be fatal.

It's doubtful whether Americans in droves will turn away from "The Wonder Years" on ABC and "Unsolved Mysteries" (NBC) to be assailed by Lenny's wif at 8 p.m.

Wednesdays this fall. But it could happen.

Clarke — pronounced Clock or Clack — has a blue-collar persona on screen that belies a shrewd performer who comes to TV, as one of the best-kept secrets in stand-up comedy. He has been the opening act for both Dolly Parton and Andrew Dice Clay. His use of certain words "held me back," kept me off major (TV) shows. Hey, my act was filthy at times, and I didn't mean it. I apologize if it ever seemed raunchy."

Clarke is one of two stand-up comics without acting experience around whom CBS is building a loveable-slob series this fall. The other is Kevin Meaney, in a spinoff of the popular John Candy movie Uncle Buck.

Viewers will either love or loathe him

Thinking back on two weeks in Hollywood spent previewing the fall TV season, I've decided there are two kinds of people in television: Those who hold press conferences, and those who hold press conferences hostage.

Among those in the second category are Ted Turner, whose washbuckling charm made the assembled critics willing hostages (as usual), and Jane Pauley, whose interminable maundering had us fantasizing about the old show-biz hook.

But in two weeks no one held a press conference hostage with quite the same lock-the-door-and-throw-away-the-key finality as Lenny

Clarke. Remember that name. By November you'll either love Lenny Clarke or loathe him. Ditto the new CBS comedy he stars in, "Lenny," about a working-class loudmouth in South Boston.

Try to imagine Roseanne Barr with testosterone. At one point in the press conference, Clarke, a burly guy with tall, bushy hair — a greaser's cut without the grease — was actually shouting at the critics. "I am not going back to the nightclub! I'm sorry! This show is not going to fail!" Not for lack of volume, certainly. Lack of good scripts, however, could be fatal.

It's doubtful whether Americans in droves will turn away from "The Wonder Years" on ABC and "Unsolved Mysteries" (NBC) to be assaulted by Lenny's wit at 8 p.m.

Wednesdays this fall. But it could happen.

Clarke — pronounced Clock or Clack — has a blue-collar persona on screen that belies a shrewd performer who comes to TV as one of the best-kept secrets in stand-up comedy. He has been the opening act for both Dolly Parton and Andrew Dice Clay. His use of certain words "held me back, kept me off major (TV) shows. Hey, my act was filthy at times, and I didn't mean it. I apologize if it ever seemed raunchy."

Clarke is one of two stand-up comics without acting experience around whom CBS is building a lovable-slob series this fall. The other is Kevin Meaney, in a spinoff of the popular John Candy movie Uncle Buck.
