Saudis ante up billions for help

JEDDAH, Saudi Arabia — Saudi Arabia, responding to a personal plea from Secretary of State James A. Baker III, Thursday gave a "multi-billion-dollar" pledge to underwrite the cost of keeping U.S. troops in the wealthy oil kingdom and repaying poorer nations for their losses in the Iraq crisis.

U.S. and Saudi officials confirmed that an agreement was reached on the Saudi commitment following a meeting between Baker and Saudi King Fahd. Both groups said no exact dollar figure was set. "We had a meeting of the minds," a senior Iraqi official said after Baker's two-hour meeting with the Saudi Arabian King at Salaam Palace. "We're talking about billion dollar figures," a senior State Department official said, also demanding anonymity.

Bush to make Iraq TV video

TOPEKA, Kan. — President Bush will accept Saddam Hussein's offer to Iraq, but only on his own terms, Bush's spokesman said Thursday.

The president will make a tape in lieu of an interview with an Iraqi TV crew. "It's a real opportunity," Bush said of Saddam's offer to televise the U.S. leader's comments. Bush's spokesman said the president had "a very distinct mes-

sage" to give the Iraqi people about American reasons for the massive military buildup in the Persian Gulf. Iraqi Ambassador Mohamed Mashat said in Washington that "of course" Iraqi TV would air Bush's message in its entirety without editing. Here you edit, in line we do not edit."

Spokesman Marla Fitzwater said Bush's address would be eight to 10 minutes long. "We will have a whole package for

U.S. Saudi Arabia was the first stop for Baker, who was seen on a trip to the Middle East and Europe by President Bush.

Mindful of increasing congressional and public pressure, Bush hopes to get the world's wealthier nations to chip into two pots — one to pay for the massive U.S. military operation in the Gulf and the other to help poorer nations, such as Turkey and Jordan, remain a part of the economic boycott against Iraq despite their losses from the cutoff of trade.

Proposed middle school would emphasize independent learning

TWIN FALLS — A new middle school would ease students out of their home rooms and into a more independent learning environment, architects say. Design West Architects of Boise interviewed teachers throughout the Twin Falls School District this week to get ideas for designing a proposed \$5 million middle school and a \$1-million high school auditorium and gymnasium.

The Twin Falls School Board will decide Oct. 11 whether to pass a resolution to put the issue before the voters sometime this year. Several teachers offered advice for the design of the middle school for PWS students, 300 each in grades 6 through 8. Sixth graders would have a home room teacher for math, science, reading

and history subjects taught in the same classroom — but would use the same physical education, music and library facilities as older students. "This gives them exposure to the rest of the school," said Jay Christopherson, educational architect for Design West. Each grade would be located in one of three separate areas of the school to promote class identity, Christopherson said. Seventh and eighth graders would have a home room, but they would go to

Nader flays mining law as taxpayer giveaway

WASHINGTON — A 118-year-old federal mining law better considered for an overhaul by Congress was criticized Thursday as a taxpayer-giveaway to business. Mining interests defended it, however, as necessary to the discovery of new mineral resources. "The law is obsolete," computer advocate Ralph Nader told a House subcommittee. "It shows disrespect for taxpayer assets." He called the giveaway program "representing the miner's point of view," Donald Pitt, a geologist and chairman of the National Landholders Advisory Board, said. "It's a way of life for hundreds of thousands of citizens and a national asset for America would be destroyed by imprudent changes."

The three men were among 41 witnesses presenting opinions before a bill introduced by Rep. FILER — From the look of the grandstands, a good crowd turned out for the rodeo Wednesday night, but the event made less in general admission ticket sales than it did the same night last year. "That decline in ticket income had Twin Falls County Fair and Rodeo Board members and staff scratching their heads at their informal Thursday noon meeting. "I could have sworn there was 2,000 people in there," Fair Manager Cindy Demoney said. The fair's professional rodeo lost \$20,000 last year. Wednesday's general admission take was \$1,490, compared with last year's \$1,822. Rodeo general admission Wednesday through Friday is \$1.

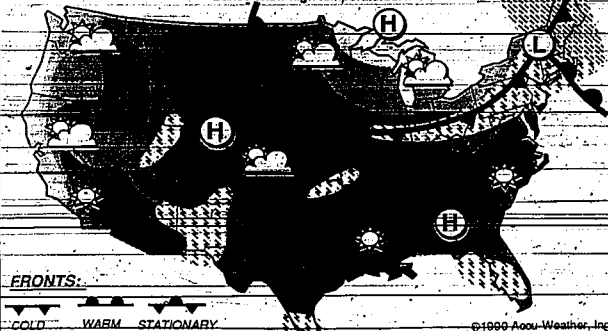

Weather summary

The National Weather Service says Idaho was situated between a low pressure center off the West Coast and high pressure over the central states Thursday.

Surges of moisture were moving northeast across the southern and central portions of the state, while a drier westerly flow reformed over the north.

Widely scattered thundershowers developed over the southern two-thirds of the state Thursday afternoon. Rainfall was light. Mostly sunny skies covered the panhandle.

Temperatures remained on the warm side with most afternoon readings in the 80s to lower 90s. The coolest mid-afternoon report was 74 degrees at McCall, while Lewiston had reached 95.

The warmest temperature in the state Thursday was 99 degrees at Lewiston. Yellow Pine reported the coldest at 37 degrees.

Elsewhere in the nation Thursday, the hottest temperature was 106 degrees at Borrego Springs, Calif. The lowest was 36 at Wisdom, Mont.

Storms drench Minnesota, Wisconsin; heat holds on

Minnesota and Wisconsin were drenched Thursday, leaving some spots under 18 inches of water, and areas in the Midwest and South back in oppressive triple-digit heat and high humidity.

Thunderstorms were active during the morning, and thundershowers caused damage to crops, livestock and buildings across northern Minnesota and northwest Wisconsin.

In Minnesota, 18 inches of water covered roads in Morgan Park and several roads in southern St. Louis County were washed out. Water was waist deep on streets in Carlton County and some highways to Cloquet were closed.

Showers and thundershowers continued into the afternoon in northern Ohio, southern Lower Michigan, northern Wisconsin and southern Upper Michigan, as well as along the Texas Gulf Coast, the Louisiana coast, and the Florida peninsula.

Showers and thundershowers were scattered in West Virginia, western Virginia, west central Alabama, south-central Kansas and northwest Oklahoma, northeast Colorado and western Nebraska, southeastern South Dakota, western Minnesota, northeast California and Oregon.

In Kansas, the heat index, combining the temperature with humidity levels, was forecast at up-to-105 degrees in central and eastern parts of the state.

Advisories for excessive heat were posted through Friday for northeast and north-central Texas. The heat index was forecast from 105 to 112 degrees. Northwestern Louisiana had heat indexes ranging from 105 to 112 degrees too.

High temperature records for Thursday were broken in Kansas City, Mo., with 92 degrees; surpassing the previous 90-degree mark. Kalamazoo, Mich., beat 102, beating the record 100; Pensacola, Fla., with 94, beating 93; and Tupelo, Miss., with 103, beating 101.

Thursday's low for the Lower 48 was 58 degrees at Truckee, Calif.

Scott said fair personnel had told volunteers manning the anti-abortion booth to either turn off the videotape or burn the screen.

Because he was too late to rearrange the booth, the organization elected to play fetal development videos and Right-to-Life commercials, Scott said.

"And she said she has heard no complaints about 'Silent Screams' or the other content of the booth," he added. "One picture shows a 20-week fetus (one picture shows a 20-week fetus) burned by a saline abortion."

"No, we've had so many wonderful responses," she said. "We agree that it's not pretty. It's not fun. We're just showing real life. We're just trying to educate people."

Some people have brought children to watch the video, she said.

Also at the noon meeting, Fair Board member Dave Wood said he had heard several fairgoers complain about both abortion information booths at the fair, including one operated by a group favoring legalized abortion.

Some people have suggested that a county fair is no place for such booths, Wood said.

Fam Lincoln, organizer of the abortion information booths for Citizens for Choice, disagreed.

"I think it's as appropriate as having Democrats and Republicans here," Lincoln said. "We're providing information on the issue."

She said several visitors to her booth had complained about the rival abortion booth with such comments as, "We're glad your booth is in such good taste. Between the movie and the videotape, it's a nice presentation."

The anti-abortion booth has copies of a controversial video on sale. AIDS "on display" models showing fetal development.

Volunteers at the Citizens for Choice booth are dispensing candy and bumper stickers and buttons.

The booth said the organization's board of directors will meet and might contest the Fair Board's decision.

Wounded American

faces detention by Iraq

WASHINGTON (AP) - An American trying to evade capture was shot and wounded by an Iraqi soldier in Kuwait, the State Department said Thursday.

Iraqi officials say the unidentified man "was discharged 24 hours, but will remain in their custody. They promise us consular access at that time," said agency spokesman Mark Dillen.

Dillen, accusing the Iraqis of "outrageous behavior," said the man was wounded in the forearm while trying to escape out of a window at his Kuwait apartment.

The incident occurred as Iraq

mandated a law imposing a sentence of life imprisonment on people who try to leave the country without permission.

Meanwhile, an undetected American citizen is expected to leave Kuwait and Iraq on Friday on what the State Department hopes will be regular evacuation flights arranged by the U.S. embassy.

In addition to American women and children whom the Iraqis have been allowing to leave since late last month, U.S. officials said they hoped adult men with medical problems also would be allowed to depart.

broadcast on Iraqi television, and then we'll have a State Department interpreter who will provide the interpretation some way" into Arabic, Fitzwater said, adding that the tape will be released generally.

On another topic, looking ahead to this weekend's superpower summit, Bush said he will use the meeting not only to discuss the Persian Gulf with Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev but to press for a quick resolution to strategic arms talks.

Before embarking on a one-day political trip to Kansas and Florida on Thursday, Bush spoke by telephone with a number of world leaders on the Gulf situation and his unending search for a settlement.

They included Syrian President Hafez al-Assad, Turkish President Turgut Ozal, French President Francois Mitterrand and West German Chancellor Helmut Kohl, the White House said.

The also-called United Nations Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar, to thank him for his unsuccessful try at resolving the Gulf crisis in talks last week in Iraq.

Bush also met Thursday with

Israel's visiting foreign minister, David Levy, in Washington.

The president received at least two pieces of welcome news during the day: Officials disclosed in Saudi Arabia that the country would contribute several billion dollars to the cost of the U.S. buildup. And a poll by NBC News and the Wall Street Journal showed 76 percent of 800 approved of the buildup, compared with 70 percent when it first began. The likely margin of error in the poll was given as 4 percentage points either way.

Najib al-Hadihi, director general of Iraq's Information Ministry, said in Baghdad that an Iraqi television crew was ready to go to Washington tomorrow to film a broadcast on state-run television.

Fitzwater said that wouldn't be necessary - "we'll produce it ourselves."

"Although we have not heard from Iraq directly, we accept their offer. The president will tape a message to the Iraqi people in the next few days."

different classrooms for each subject, he said.

Other features of the middle school would include:

- Home economics room: While traditional home ec classes center around food and clothing, the new approach includes lessons on family living, interior design, foods and clothing. Home economics classrooms would therefore be built with instructional alcoves for each subject.
- Gymnasium: The gym would be divided into two parts, a working gym for general sports with no bleachers and a much larger gym with moveable bleachers. A locker room would be built underneath the bleachers.
- Special education: This area is still under consideration because the Twin Falls district has initiated a pilot program in which special needs children are taught in their regular classrooms. Two central classrooms would probably be built for them.
- Music: The school would include two classrooms: a choral and general music room, a band and orchestra room. The school would also have practice rooms, an office and storage space.

Imposed mail slowdown opposed

WASHINGTON — A Postal Service decision to slow delivery of some first-class mail in the face of a new rate increase "is going over like a lead balloon," Postmaster General Anthony M. Frank was told Thursday.

Telling Americans that longer delivery times for some mail results in improved service is "double-speak — it doesn't compute, it doesn't jibe," Rep. Glenn English, D-Okla., said at a hearing by the House Government Operations subcommittee on government information.

Frank said the payoff will be more consistent delivery time. Delaying some overnight deliveries will affect less than 5 percent of first-class mail, he said. "The result will be a win-win situation — improved mail service for our customers and improved efficiency for the Postal Service."

U.S. tentative on new drug policy

WASHINGTON — The Bush administration on Thursday tentatively endorsed the Colombian government's offer to spare cocaine traffickers extradition to the United States if they surrender and confess their crimes.

"If the government and people of Colombia are now able to enforce their own laws against drug trafficking — prosecuting, convicting, and incarcerating these thugs — so much the better," Attorney General Dick Thornburgh said in a statement.

But Thornburgh warned that "if the so-called extraditables fail to take advantage of this opportunity to surrender, confess their crimes, and serve jail sentences, we will continue to support Colombia's effort to arrest and extradite them to the United States for trial."

Oil industry backs spill cleanup system

WASHINGTON — A new corporation, backed by the oil industry, will spend \$800 million over the next five years on a nationwide system designed to clean up the worst oil spills, its president announced Thursday.

The cost is three times the original estimate of a petroleum industry task force which set up the Marine Spill Response Corp. Corporation President John D. Costello said the increases were necessary to do the job. The company plans to construct five regional centers in areas where spills are most likely to occur: Port Everglades, Fla., north of Miami; Lake Charles, La., near the Texas border; Port Hueneme, Calif., north of Los Angeles, and Seattle.

U.S. capital spending predicted low

WASHINGTON — American businesses plan to increase spending for new plants and equipment by 10 percent in 1990, the smallest growth in three years, the government said Thursday.

Analysis said the Commerce Department's survey shows that businesses remain leery of a softening economy and worried about falling profits. The department said the survey found businesses planning to spend \$526.9 billion for expansion and modernization this year, the fourth consecutive year of increased business investment.

Police want tough gun law enacted

WASHINGTON — Cleveland's police chief and other supporters of firearms controls on Thursday urged federal action to bar guns from schoolyards and nearby, but a federal official said such a law could not be enforced.

"You have the power to restore confidence in the ability of government to safeguard our children, our nation's most valuable resource," Chief Edward P. Kovacic told a House subcommittee hearing on the plan. The measure, similar to one in an omnibus crime package approved by the Senate, calls for maximum five-year prison sentences for those bringing firearms within 1,000 feet of a schoolyard.

Mapplethorpe charge going to trial

CINCINNATI — A jury must decide whether an art gallery and its director broke obscenity laws by exhibiting five sexually graphic Robert Mapplethorpe photographs, a judge ruled Thursday.

Hamilton County Municipal Judge David J. Albanese ordered Dennis Barrie and the Contemporary Arts Center to stand trial Sept. 24 on one misdemeanor charge each of pandering obscenity.

Barrie and the gallery already were scheduled to go on trial that day on one charge each of using children in material involving nudity. Albanese said the trial, which will address the obscenity and nudity charges, could last 10 days.

Drug czar enjoys an easy day

WASHINGTON (AP) — The czar was the tipoff that drug control chief William Bennett was not going to face many tough questions from a key Democratic senator on the first anniversary of the war on drugs.

"It's been a year and I think you've made some great progress," Senate Judiciary Chairman Joseph R. Biden told Bennett after giving him the chocolate-iced cake outside the hearing room.

Bennett had no problem with that assessment. The two also agreed that much more needs to be done and that Congress must be pushed to provide the money for that war even as it faces other problems such as the Persian Gulf, the deficit, and the savings and loan crisis.

In fact, the most severe critic of the Republican citation of the drug war was Sen. Arlen Specter, a Republican from Pennsylvania.

Like some House Democrats, Specter called for dividing federal drug war money equally between law enforcement and treatment and education. The breakdown is now almost 70 percent for law enforcement, the rest for treatment and education.

President Bush and Bennett marked the first anniversary of the national drug control strategy Wednesday with a white paper showing improvements in the drug war.

The statistics cited a decline in emergency room admissions for cocaine and heroin, surveys showing Americans' increasing hostility toward illegal drugs and increases in prices for cocaine and reduction in its purity, indicating a reduction in supply.

The wholesale price of a kilo of cocaine now ranges from \$17,500 to \$35,000, up from a range of \$11,000 to \$25,000 last year.

But in 1984, Biden noted, the wholesale price was \$40,000 to \$50,000.

The number of cocaine-related emergency room cases declined slightly last year to 42,145 at hospitals checked by the federal government. Biden pointed out that those same emergency rooms had only 10,248 cocaine-related cases in 1985.

But Biden, D-Del., took pains not to blame Bennett.

"The fact that the problem is still extremely bad is not a comment on what I consider the extremely good job you have been doing," Biden told him.

Bennett assured Biden that the drug issues remain a top priority for Bush, who said Wednesday that the issue "remains No. 1" for him despite the other crises that seem to preoccupy the White House these days.

"We're not saying the (drug) war is over," Bennett said. "We're certainly not saying it will be over soon."

Too many cooks?

'Neurotic, psychotic' behavior keeps Gainesville slayings suspect in jail

SHARPE, Fla. (AP) — A judge Thursday cited erratic behavior as a reason to uphold a \$1 million bond on an assault charge for a young man suspected in the slayings of five college students in Gainesville.

Homicide task force investigators were searching the 18-year-old's Gainesville apartment and car for clues to the slayings. But police cautioned he is only one of eight leading suspects, and his brother said he's being made a scapegoat.

Because of the unusually high bond, Edward Lewis Humphrey has been in the Brevard County jail since Aug. 30 on a charge of harboring his grandmother.

"I see before me a very disturbed individual," Circuit Judge Martin Budnick said at the bail reduction hearing at the jail. "I see a great deal of acting out — neurotic or psychotic behavior."

Jail officer Emily Ghamb testified Humphrey described himself as dan-

gerous and "savage" threatened a female inmate and called himself "John" and warned: "I o h n doesn't take no prisoners."

Brevard State Attorney Norm Wolfinger, arguing for the high bond, said: "The fact remains he is a suspect in the Gainesville murders and he knows that."

Public Defender J.R. Russo objected, and the judge agreed he couldn't set a bond based on a case Humphrey hasn't been charged in. However, the judge said he would be doing "a dis-service to the community" if he allowed Humphrey to go free.

Budnick ruled that Humphrey is a danger to the community. Budnick decided he would consider another request for bond reduction and wanted to hear medical testimony about Humphrey's mental condition.

Russo did not comment afterward on whether he would seek another hearing. He said he was preparing for the trial on the grounds as a result charge, tentatively scheduled for October.

Humphrey's grandmother testified she didn't want to press charges and would welcome Humphrey back into her home, where Humphrey's mother also lives, in Indiantown, 180 miles from Gainesville.

"I want it dropped," definitely," Elma Hlavaty, her right cheek and right eye badly bruised, said as Humphrey watched. She said she didn't fear her grandson, although she had called police repeatedly. She said she couldn't remember anything about this night of the incident.

Hospitals ready for casualties

SAUDI ARABIA (AP) — The U.S. military has built a sophisticated network of medical facilities in the Saudi desert, including 13 hospitals that officials say are equipped to handle virtually any type of combat wound.

The hospitals include two medical ships being deployed in the Persian Gulf, along with 13 facilities spread out across the eastern province of the desert kingdom. Hundreds of doctors and nurses, who can perform anything from neurosurgery to heart surgery to orthopedic surgery, have been flown in to care for the estimated 60,000 U.S. troops so far deployed in Operation Desert Shield.

Washington says the American troops are here to defend Saudi Arabia in case of an attack by Iraq. The scope of the medical system clearly shows that officials want to be prepared for anything that could happen. "Our hospitals are just as capable, if not more capable, of doing anything we do in the states," Col. Jerome Faust, commander of the 44th Medical Brigade, said Thursday. His brigade runs the Army's hospitals in Saudi Arabia.

The U.S. Navy is building a 500-bed hospital in the desert.

The state-of-the-art facility is housed in 24 air conditioned canvas tents, which include intensive care units, an operating ward, and an intensive care unit.

"We have it all, we're a little city," said Capt. Richard Mayo, the hospital's commander. "This is larger than any ground facility we had in Vietnam."

When fully started, the hospital will have a staff of 900, 800 of them medical personnel.

At another location, the Army is building a "bubble" hospital, a 200-bed facility with a pharmacy attached.

It is housed in a series of caterpillar-shaped tents made of rubber structures that resemble giant inner tubes. A tubine engine heats and cools the interior.

About 1.5 million tons of equipment from narcotics to hospital beds, were shipped from the United States for this hospital.

Soldiers have worked mostly at night to set up the facility because of the scorching daytime temperatures. The weary doctors will eventually be assigned to it.

Like the others, the hospital will be almost exclusively for Americans. Saudis may be treated occasionally at U.S. facilities, but the kingdom has its own modern system of medical care.

Besides the hospitals, each military unit, such as a Marine brigade in the desert, has doctors and paramedics assigned to it. In combat, their role is to keep wounded soldiers alive until they can be taken to a hospital.

U.S. allies offer encouragement, little money for crisis

SEOUL, South Korea — While Saddam Hussein has given new urgency to an old debate over whether America's friends should bear more of the burden for defending democracy, their response in the current crisis has been far from overwhelming.

Tuesday Secretary Nicholas Brady is on an 18,500-mile odyssey that has taken him from Europe to Asia in search of economic assistance, while Secretary of State James A. Baker III launched his own Middle East fund-raising mission Thursday in the Saudi Arabian capital of Jeddah.

The two cabinet members are seeking aid to defray the high cost of keeping a protective U.S. military shield on the Saudi-Kuwait border.

Following meetings in Paris and London, Brady insisted he was getting strong words of encouragement, especially from British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher.

But while the words have been flowing, the flow of money has not.

Neither the French nor the British committed to specific dollar amounts and officials of the 12-nation European Community were scheduled to take up the question of increased assistance at a meeting

While one official traveling with Brady on the flight from London to Seoul said it would not be unreasonable for the allies to pick up the entire \$1 billion cost of the U.S. troop buildup, that statement was viewed more as a negotiating ploy than a reasonable expectation of the outcome.

For one thing, the Brady delegation faced an even harder sell in meetings Friday with South Korean President Roh Tae-woo and Japanese Prime Minister Toshiki Kaifu.

The administration is turning to Asia for support since both nations depend heavily on Middle Eastern oil.

Japan has pledged \$1 billion to support the troop buildup, but did so only after Bush made a personal call to Kaifu.

The administration says privately what critics in Congress are saying openly — that Japan should do much more, given the size of its economy.

Analysis

The current debate has echoes that reach back to the height of the Cold War, when critics contended that America's huge military burden was diverting resources from critical areas such as making the investments needed to boost productivity.

Japan and other countries without large military obligations were getting a free ride, the argument went, urging them to make the enormous investments needed to compete effectively in the world marketplace.

In dispatching Brady and Bush on their money missions, President Bush declared that the "shape of the post-Cold War world was at stake in the Persian Gulf crisis."

What he left unsaid was that America, hobbled by a sluggish economy and a huge mountain of debt, can no longer afford to go it alone.

But officials traveling with Brady insist that the fund-raising effort would make sense even if the administration weren't bedeviled by the mammoth budget deficit.

They note that when the European Community dismantles its economic barriers in 1992, the combined economies of its dozen members will equal America's \$5 trillion annual gross national product.

Analysis

GNP could well surpass that of the United States by the end of this decade.

We live in a changing world whether there is a budget deficit or not," said one senior official traveling with Brady who spoke on condition that he not be named.

In that changed world, we Americans have a right to expect that the burdens will be shared more appropriately.

Despite the lukewarm public response from countries being targeted for aid, other forces could prod the allies to do more.

For one thing, Japan risks triggering an avalanche of resentment in its biggest foreign market unless it pays a bigger share.

In addition, there is a belief that the allies cannot afford to waver in this effort, given the threat posed by Iraq President Saddam Hussein.

Both the Brady and Baker missions were designed as highly visible campaigns to demonstrate that the allies are a united force, thus raising the stakes considerably if there is a perceived failure.

One of the most important audiences for this whole thing is Saddam Hussein," said another official on Brady's plane who spoke on background. "We need to let him see that this is not one country or a couple of countries, but it really is the whole world."

China typhoon death toll reaches 106

BEIJING — The death toll in two coastal provinces battered last week by Typhoon Abe has reached 106, an official report said Thursday. Another 40 people were missing and 850 were injured in the typhoon, the sixth major storm to hit the southeast coast this summer, according to the report in China Daily. Abe came ashore one week ago in south Zhejiang province. It hit Shanghai, China's most populous city, and the neighboring provinces of Jiangsu and Anhui. About 720,000 people were stranded by floods. Strong winds and a heavy downpour halted the Zhejiang-Hangzhou railway for 10 hours.

Gunmen kill 5 at S. Africa train station

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa — Two gunmen opened fire on a crowded train platform, killing five people and wounding nine, police said Thursday. Violence also continued in black townships. Col. Frans Malherbe said the attackers began shooting "for no reason or reason" at the Jeppe Station in Johannesburg. "They didn't say anything," Malherbe said. "They just walked up and opened fire." Earlier, police in the township of Soweto fired tear gas and shotguns to disperse rival black factions in street clashes. Police said at least one person was stabbed to death and 16 were injured.

Korean talks end on optimistic note

SEOUL, South Korea — The first round of historic talks between senior officials of North Korea and South Korea ended on a relatively upbeat note Thursday, with each side hinting at compromise in two areas where bitter disagreements have traditionally soured relations — U.N. membership and family exchanges. No major agreement was announced after the close of the second day of negotiations between the prime ministers of each country and high-ranking political and military delegates.

Aid to stranded Asians stalled by foulups

AZRAQ, Jordan (AP) — A night cause no one will pay to get them, more of foul-ups and conflicts has stalled relief for 70,000 Asians from Save the Children. Jordan, according to Rebecca Salti of Save the Children, 3,000 desperate workers said Thursday. Bangladeshis, Indians, Sri Lankans and others camped at Shaalan I, on a rocky, scorpion-infested plain, awaiting clearance to officially enter Jordan. "Thousands" of others were at Shaalan II and at the Rawwashid border post, waiting to join an estimated 105,000 others already in the Jordanian capital. Each day, an estimated 20,000 people reach the border. The Jordanian news agency reported that 605,000 evacuees have crossed into Jordan since Iraq's Aug. 2 invasion of Kuwait. Most have left but thousands remain. "These people are ready to march on Amman," Mrs. Salti said at a meeting of voluntary and church organizations trying to help. "They're that desperate." A Sri Lankan refugee organizer described despair and bedlam.

Utah prison escapees caught without trouble

SUNDANCE, Utah (AP) — Two prison escapees, one a convicted killer, were captured without incident Thursday as they cowered in tall grass near an outdoor theater near actor Robert Redford's Sundance Resort, authorities said.

The capture ended a 30-hour search, much of it in the rugged Wasatch Mountains southeast of Utah State Prison, for the inmates who escaped Wednesday by hiding in an altered maintenance vehicle.

Earlier Thursday, a host at the Mt. Timpanogos Campground at the top of American Fork Canyon to the south encountered the inmates and alerted them to half-and-half exchanged shots with them, said Utah County Sheriff's Capt. Dave Lamph.

BOISE (AP) — Roger Fairchild, the Republican who is running against Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus, says the incumbent has been misrepresenting the source of his hefty campaign finances.

In a statement Wednesday, Fairchild said Andrus alleged in a weekend interview that he got 91 percent of his campaign donations from Idaho sources, but the actual figure was less than 60 percent.

"My opponent, who has repeatedly refused to release a record of his personal finances while in office, is willing to concede the fact that his main donation is for sale to the highest bidder," Fairchild declared.

Andrus was quoted in a weekend newspaper story as saying that 91 percent of his funds came from Idaho residents.

He said: "Fairchild's latest charge is a flat-out lie. Thursday 91 percent of the individual contributions he has received were from Idaho."

Andrus said, "The truly disturbing aspect of my opponent's charges is the hypocrisy they contain. He seeks fit to criticize our state contributions to my campaign, but you don't hear him utter a word about the out-of-state dollars that fuel Larry Craig's, Steve Symms' or Skip Smyser's a campaign. Is it only contributions to a Democrat that bother him?"

Andrus also said Fairchild is being hypocritical because of his repeated calls for a ban on political action committee donations.

"Yet, during his 10 years as a state senator, he apparently had no qualms at all about receiving PAC contributions. On at least 36 different occasions he received such funds."

Andrus said, "I make no apologies for having mounted an aggressive, grassroots fundraising effort. I have been fortunate to enjoy the support of many in the business community, educators, conservationists and thousands of individuals."

In response to a request, the Andrus campaign prepared a breakdown of in-state and out-of-state campaign contributions. From Jan. 1, 1986, to July 30, the campaign staff said Andrus received total contributions of \$270,000 of which \$190,000 were from Idaho, just over 70 percent, and \$80,000 from out-of-state.

During that period, 91 percent of all individual contributors were Idaho residents, the staff said.

From the start of 1989 through July, 1990, the Andrus contributions were 63 percent in-state and 37 percent out-of-state, the report said.

"My opponent is willfully concealing the fact that his administration is for sale to the highest bidder," Fairchild said. "Idahoans would not be surprised to learn that many of our elections, yet these reports show how our state interests have gained a direct line to the Idaho governor's office."

LaRocco says Smyser grades low on schools

BOISE (AP) — Democratic congressional candidate Larry LaRocco claims his Republican opponent, state Sen. Skip Smyser, has earned nothing more than a "D" grade for his support of education during 10 years in the state Legislature.

"Skip Smyser has a long and sorry record of voting against education and the voters ought to know that," LaRocco said on Thursday. "The only reason he doesn't get an 'F' is because at least he showed up to vote. Attendance deserves some credit."

But LaRocco's blast came just five months after Smyser campaign manager Mike Thiessen said the Democrat supported the state senator for his commitment to educational support that garnered Smyser the endorsement of the Idaho Education Association in his last three legislative campaigns.

During a joint appearance in Council on April 4, Thiessen said LaRocco told the audience, "Skip and I have both been endorsed by the Idaho Education Association in the past because of a commitment to educational programs."

"For him to say Skip Smyser is against education now contradicts his statements of five months ago," Thiessen said.

ISU Idaho Falls facility not for grads

IDAHO FALLS — Idaho State University President Richard Bowen says he doesn't understand why people were surprised to hear that the primary function of the new higher education facility in Idaho Falls was to serve undergraduates, because that has been the intention for 40 years.

Bowen said Thursday ISU repeatedly has requested funds for a \$7.5 million building to consolidate Idaho Falls higher education programs, and that includes undergraduate offerings.

"My point is, that this thing has been (on) a consistent path for four years. The same request has been repeatedly made," he said during a media breakfast at Idaho Falls.

State board checks new use for rail line

ASHTON — The Idaho Foundation of Parks and Lands Board is looking into the possibility of turning the abandoned railroad spur between Ashton and Teronin in eastern Idaho into the third longest excursion line in the nation.

The board is doing its own homework to determine the cost and risk factors involved, said Ashton businessman Darrell Reinke, who first raised the possibility of converting the 30.8-mile line into a tourist attraction.

The board has set up a six-member committee to investigate the feasibility of the plan over the next six weeks.

Union Pacific Railroad, which abandoned the line, has endorsed the proposal, spokesman John Bromley said.

Critics want hydro project stopped

ASHTON — More than a year after a hydroelectric project on Fall River received the green light from the federal government, critics are trying to put the brakes on it.

Opponents of the Fall River Hydroelectric Project about 11 miles east of Ashton are asking Federal Energy Regulatory Commission officials to take another look at recreation use along the river.

"We believe the data they were given were very inaccurate," said John Oehl, an Idaho Falls kayaker. Oehl is a member of Friends of Fall River, a nearby environmental group.

Other opponents are passing out questionnaires to kayakers, rafters and fishermen to get a gauge on river use.

Neighbors rescue sick farmer's harvest

CRAIGMONT — Old-fashioned neighborliness is not dead. This week it was the fact that snowed. It combines harvesting the last of a sick farmer's barley crop.

A group of Nezperce and Craigmont area farmers put aside their own work Wednesday to help Richard Paul, who has been ill for the past two months with complications from an earlier attack of appendicitis. David Branson of Dokken Implement in Nezperce organized the group. He cull several area farmers and made plans to begin the harvest of about 400 acres of Paul's standing barley.

U of I aims program at state's tourism

MOSCOW — Demands on Idaho's natural resources and beauty, especially from the exploding tourism industry, are not only benefiting the state treasury but changing a way of life in many of the small towns scattered throughout the state.

And the University of Idaho's College of Forestry is modifying its focus to accommodate not only the traditional concerns of trees, water and range but also people, and lots of them.

The school's initial effort is focused on a \$140,000 proposal being reviewed by the state Board of Education to develop a program in natural resource-based tourism. The Department of Wildlife Recreation Management has already been renamed the Department of Resource Recreation and Tourism.

Coeur d'Alene school levy considered

COEUR D'ALENE — Coeur d'Alene taxpayers will have to come up with more money for local schools if officials go ahead with a plan to seek emergency funding to compensate for higher-than-expected enrollment.

"We're leaning that way," Superintendent Keith Tolzin said Wednesday of the emergency levy measure after reviewing first-day attendance figures. Tolzin said he probably would call a special school board meeting Friday or Monday to discuss the levy option. Under state law, the district has only until 5 p.m. Monday to decide whether to call for the additional funding.

Sexual abuse allegedly prompted murder

NAMPA — Lynn Sepulveda allegedly killed her husband because he had sexually abused one of her children and was threatening to molest another, Sepulveda's daughter says.

Sepulveda was charged with voluntary manslaughter in Canyon County magistrate court last week in the Aug. 28 shotgun slaying of her husband of two years, Ruben Rubio, 51, in their home near Nampa.

Craig named to environmental 'Dirty Dozen'

WASHINGTON (AP) — Republican Congressman Larry Craig on Thursday became the third member of the state's congressional delegation to be named to the biennial "Dirty Dozen" list of the Washington-based Environmental Action Group.

The five-term congressman, facing Democrat Ron Twiegler for the seat of retiring Republican U.S. Sen. James McClure, received a zero rating on 11 specific votes cited by the environmental group during the recent Congress. He was absent for the 12th vote used by the group in its ratings.

"As a member of the Interior Committee, Craig has been a relentless crusader for the user interests that exploit taxpayers and miners with their grantees, mining and timber grants," said Environmental Action Director John Caplan.

But Craig spokesman David Fish suggested it was obvious that the positions taken by Environmental Action on some issues like water rights and predator control were counter to those held by the majority of Idahoans while Craig has voted to protect water rights, jobs and land.

"If they support giving away Idaho's water rights, I think Idahoans would have some pretty big questions about them," Fish said.

"We face a challenge in Idaho, he said. "Larry Craig has the experi-

ence to strike that balance."

Clapin also criticized Craig for what she said was an attempt to weaken the Endangered Species Act of 1973 in the face of the spotted owl controversy, engineering a shift in responsibility of the predator control program that she claimed has dramatically increased "official executions" of animals such as mountain lions and coyotes, and backing major cuts in financial support for water pollution control programs.

Republican Sen. Steve Symms has been named to the list twice, in 1976 while in the House and again in 1986 while running for re-election to the Senate.

The other Idaho congressional delegation member named to the Dirty Dozen list was former GOP Rep. George Hansen in 1978.

- Continue plutonium processing at Rocky Flats.
- Put federal law above state law in oil spill liability.
- Maintain a higher standard oil spillers must meet before being liable for the full cost of cleanup.
- Deny the Environmental Protection Agency cabinet status.
- Retain a mandated timber-cutting level and \$840 million in timber subsidies in Alaska's Tongass National Forest.
- Overturn a court requirement that federal wilderness land be given specific water rights.
- Increase acreage subsidized for raising federally limited irrigation water.
- Prohibit the federal government from condemning lands for wilderness areas without landowner consent.
- Cut support for the United Nation Population Fund by \$8.5 million.

Agency will review salmon species' status

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — The National Marine Fisheries Services has decided to accept petitions requesting that four wild stocks of chinook salmon and one stock of coho salmon be added to the federal list of endangered species.

The decision Wednesday begins a status review by the agency, which must be completed by June 7, 1991. Then it will decide whether to propose listing the species as endangered or threatened, with a final decision due by June of 1992.

Gov. Cecil Andrus said Thursday Idaho has been pushing for more measures to enhance wild salmon runs into Idaho. But the federal decision to study listing forces the state to take action.

"I'm not surprised," Andrus said. "Now we have to get together the scientific data to keep (the salmon) off the Endangered Species list."

Petitions submitted by Oregon Trout and other environmental sportsmen's groups ask for federal protection for spring, summer and fall chinook salmon that run up the Snake River and its tributaries, including the Salmon River. They also request protection for coho salmon in the lower Columbia River.

Michael E. Hillman, deputy assistant administrator for fisheries, said he terminated the petitions present substantial scientific information indicating that the listing may be warranted.

Agency officials said in a submission for the Federal Register outlining the decision.

The public and other agencies have 60 days following its publication in the Federal Register to submit comments.

During this time scientists are asked to present information on several technical issues, including definition of the distinct salmon populations that qualify as a species, the threshold for threatened or endangered species status, the role of artificial stocking and the cause of the decline of the salmon stocks.

Bill Bakke, executive director for Oregon Trout, said he was pleased with the decision but concerned that the agencies and industries that have agreed in the way of solving the problem will dominate the status review.

"The problem in the scientific review is that the environmental community is outgunned by industry, so the record is going to be heavily weighted against listing," he said.

Tom Geise, fish and wildlife manager for the Pacific Northwest Utilities Conference Committee, which represents private electric companies, said his group's interest is that the review be done right.

"What we'd like to see is that the whole process be based on good science," said Geise.

Gem high court ponders fate of multiple killer

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Arguing listening to a full day of arguments, the Idaho Supreme Court is considering the fate of an Idaho Falls man facing execution for a 1987 drug-related crime spree in eastern Idaho.

In two separate hearings, the Supreme Court listened Thursday to appeals by attorneys for Paul Ezra Rhoades, 39, from death sentences in first-degree murder cases.

One member of the Supreme Court, Justice Larry Boyle, did not sit on the cases, and was replaced by district judges from eastern Idaho.

Boyle, formerly a district judge at Idaho Falls, handled one of the cases and sentenced Rhoades to death for killing Idaho Falls teacher James Michelbacher early in 1987.

Seventh District Judge James Herndon of Bingham County handed the other case and sentenced Rhoades to death for killing Bingham convenience store clerk Stacy Baldwin on about the same time.

Rhoades also was ordered to spend the rest of his life in prison, with no possibility of parole, for a third slaying: that of Nolan Hadden, 21, Blackfoot, at an Idaho Falls convenience store. That appeal is being handled separately.

Besides the first-degree murder charges, Rhoades also was sentenced for kidnapping, robbery, rape, infamous crime against nature and using a firearm to commit felonies in the Michelbacher case. I

The prosecution alleged during the trials that Rhoades staged a series of robberies and associated killings to obtain money for a drug habit.

Andrus, others should see drug funds distributed fairly

The Magic Valley is making do with less federal money to fight drugs than a lot of other areas in Idaho - a lot less money.

Kootenai County, population 67,300, received \$188,000 this year for its anti-drug efforts.

The entire Magic Valley - population 155,000, received \$80,000 for the same period.

The state Criminal Justice Council, which divides federal drug enforcement money among cities and counties in Idaho, makes its decisions based upon grant proposals written by local and regional law enforcement agencies and task forces.

Bonneville County, population 72,000, asked for \$134,000 and got every penny of it.

The Magic Valley Drug Task force, by contrast, asked for \$224,000 and got 36 percent of it.

There were problems with the Magic Valley application. Requests for \$23,000 for furniture, and a 12-fold increase in funding over two of them. The fact that the task force was reorganized in the fourth and final year of the grant cycle didn't help the Magic Valley's chances of getting more money.

But the fact remains that 15.5 percent of the state's population is getting 6.2 percent of the federal money available for fighting drugs.

And there's no question the Magic Valley needs the money.

Marzell Kelley, special agent for Region IV of the Idaho State Bureau of Narcotics reports that his agency is making

ever larger seizures of drugs in the Magic Valley.

Because of the geography of south central Idaho, many of the drugs in the Magic Valley are not destined for this area. They are on their way to other areas or other states.

The crime rates in Twin Falls and Burley are among the highest in the state for property crime, law enforcement officers say, and that reflects a serious drug problem.

The problem is not going to be solved with federal money, but let's not pretend that source of help isn't important. Some of it goes for "buy" money - or money used to buy drugs from dealers. Without that, busting dealers is well nigh impossible.

More importantly, those dollars mean manpower, which is the real key to drug enforcement.

The Magic Valley Drug Task Force has two full-time investigators, which is two more than it had four years ago, but that's not enough to cover 11,572 square miles.

Four agencies represented on the state Criminal Justice Council got 37 percent of the money available to local task forces this year. The Magic Valley doesn't have a representative on the council, but that shouldn't matter.

What matters is that we have a big and growing drug problem and less than our share of the federal dollars available to fight it. That's a matter for the governor and the Legislature to rectify in the future.

School bond proposal was carefully considered, well-planned

I will attempt to address those issues relating to the process utilized to produce the current bond proposal. However, the board, administration and community committees are prepared to answer any and all questions posed by the district voters.

This will be accomplished through meetings with agricultural, business and civic groups, parent/teacher organizations, use of the media and open public meetings.

The proposal that will go on the ballot is a carefully considered one. It is the result of nearly two years of study

with input from virtually every segment of our community. Specifically, the school district recognized that there was a need for new and expanded facilities in late 1988 and early 1989.

Based on this recognition of need, the board appointed a committee on Feb. 14, 1989, to study the facility problems and needs of our district (the facilities committee).

This committee was comprised of seven members from the community and seven members from the school district.

The committee met on a regular basis and submitted its recommendations and findings to the board on Dec. 6, 1989. One of the specific recommendations from this committee was that the board should develop a

comprehensive (strategic) plan to meet the educational needs of the students in this district for five to ten years into the future.

During this same period of time, the board was studying other alternatives to help alleviate the facilities' overcrowding that we were then experiencing.

We considered year-round schools, split sessions of school and the utilization of portable classrooms.

The district ultimately purchased six portable classrooms for this school year at a total cost of approximately \$250,000.

The board was also studying and developing curriculum changes to enhance every student's educational opportunities, including the presentation of that curriculum in a different forum such as middle schools.

All of this was done at regularly noticed open public meetings of the board.

After receipt of the facilities committee's report in December 1989, the board appointed

another community/school committee to undertake the task of refining the recommendations presented by the facilities committee.

This committee was to recommend solutions to rectify the problems existing in the district on a short-term basis and also incorporate a long-range plan that would be in effect to assist this district through the year 2000.

This is exactly what was accomplished by this committee and is the basis of the bond issue which will be presented to the district voters.

The people who served on the planning committee again represented every segment of this community.

There were representatives from the school/parent organizations, teachers, administrators, business people, farmers and board representatives at this meeting.

It was only a closed-door meeting to the

media.

There never has been anything secretive or sudden about this process.

We have attempted, as a board, to openly discuss the problems we are facing, the approaches we anticipated taking to resolve these problems and the committees which we established to help us through this process. The input of the public has always been encouraged and even solicited.

The board has been very deliberate in developing this proposal over the past year and a half, and we believe there is ample time in which to fully inform all of the district voters of the needs of this district and the rationale behind the proposed solution for resolving those needs.

Washington—Television viewers aren't getting a full selection of college football games due to restrictions on competition, the Federal Trade Commission said Thursday in announcing it will try to change the system.

The College Football Association and Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association are allegedly inhibiting competition, both among schools that want to market their games and TV stations that want to show them, the FTC is charging in an administrative complaint.

"We want to have the marketplace determine what games are shown and when," said Kevin Arques, director of the FTC Bureau of Competition.

He said the current system, under which the CFA negotiates a contract for its 64 member schools, is not in the best interests of consumers, schools or television networks.

The CFA immediately announced its intention to fight the charges.

"We think the system is opening to the benefit of consumers," said spokeswoman Linda Thomas.

Another FTC spokesman, CFA is not a former FFA subsidiary. CFA is not a former FFA subsidiary.

ABC Sports issued a statement asserting its exclusive arrangement with CFA is "entirely lawful and in the public interest." The agreement is designed to offer a broad selection of college football games to the widest possible audience.

The number and quality of games available to viewers will benefit viewers, advertisers and college football.

An administrative law judge will rule on the allegations of anti-competitive practices after a hearing Nov. 13. The decision can be appealed to the five FTC commissioners and ultimately to the U.S. Court of Appeals.

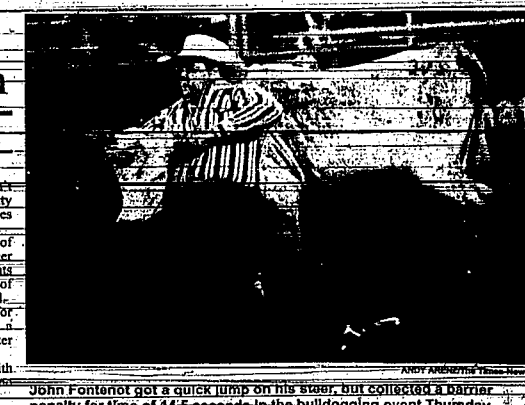

Gulf crisis, recession worries send stock market down

NEW-YORK (AP)—The stock market spread about chances for any early resolution of the crisis in the Persian Gulf. The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks dropped 31.93 to 2,597.29.

Declining issues outnumbered advances Friday, with 9-to-5 nationwide trading of New York Stock Exchange-listed stocks, with 511 up, 960 down and 490 unchanged. The price of oil climbed as pessimism Speculation has begun to spread on Wall Street that the data might encourage the Federal Reserve to adopt a more stimulative credit policy in an effort to ease strains on the economy.

But Wall Streeters are not entirely convinced that long-term interest rates would automatically fall in response to such a move.

In fact, some say, rates could rise in that setting if fears increased that the Fed was softening its stand against inflation. That, in turn, would stand to leave the central bank in an even worse policy bind than it has been confronted with now.

Sluggish August sales figures from leading retailing companies, meanwhile, helped fuel recession fears and induced selling of several retail stocks.

The Limited fell 1 1/2 to 15 1/4. Wal-Mart Stores 1/2 to 27 3/4; Toys R Us 1/4 to 22 1/2; Pacific Stores 1/4 to 19 1/4, and J.C. Penney 1/4 to 45 3/4.

Losers among the blue-chips included Boeing, down 1 1/2 to 47 3/4; General Electric at 60; American Telephone & Telegraph, down 1/4 to 31 1/4; and PepsiCo, down 1/4 to 24 3/4.

Readers Corp., posted the day's biggest percentage decline among NYSE issues, down 1 1/2 to 7 3/4. The company said it postponed losses for 1990 and fourth quarter, citing excess inventories in the distribution system for room air conditioners.

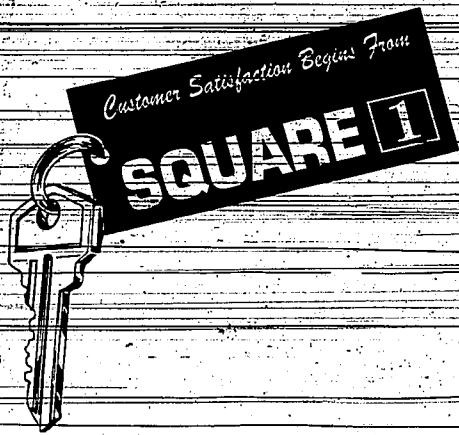

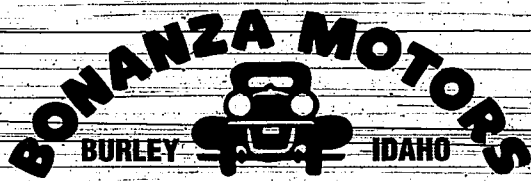

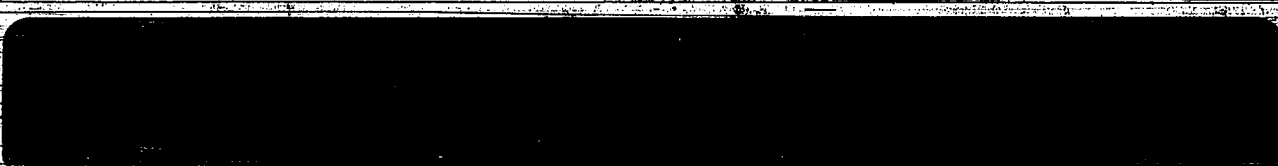

Fox Children's Network enters Saturday cartoons

There's a new player in the Saturday-morning television ballgame this fall. A rookie with all the tools.

The name is Fox. And it means business. Hardly looking the part of the gun-shy neophyte, the Fox Children's Network isn't merely speaking on the air with a show of two but is instead unveiling three hours of fun and six shows' worth of programming in its freshman season that begins Saturday.

Yes, this appears to be a network in for the long haul, committing better than \$100 million to producing original kids' programming for both Saturday mornings and weekday afternoons during the next four years.

It's hardly what NBC, CBS and CBS-News did at a time when Saturday morning viewership and advertising revenue are already on the decline.

What DeSesh and Fox hope to do is the Saturday-morning mix, an "alternative, riskier thing that is original and extremely offbeat."

If we can provide good programming, we'll be a major player from day one," says Knight-Ridder News Service.

LOS ANGELES — Details, details: Take a film that cost a reported \$50 million to make, get one tiny thing wrong and what do you have?

Call it the great picture-fixing pas. It's a serious scene in "Die Hard" where Bruce Willis, the earnest terrorist-buster, puts a coin in an airport pay phone clearly marked as the property of Pacific Bell.

Except that the film is set at Dulles International Airport, which is located on the outskirts of Washington, D.C. The picture draws an audience gallop every time.

"Movies are (generally) so well-done, so expertly crafted," says entertainment journalist Bill Givens, author of the upcoming book "Film Flubs," "that something stands out and is glaringly wrong, you can't help but notice. And usually laugh."

From 1910s Westerns' undone by the slow crawl of an airplane across the corner of the frame to "The Two Jakes," 1940s ambience updated by the sight of a 1980s bank cash machine, continuity gaffes, as they're called in the film industry, are nothing new.

What's new this fall

- FOX (premiering Saturday): "Zazzo U," an education-minded animated series of vignettes centered in a school staffed by dancing crayons, zany animals and rap singers. "Tom and Jerry Kids," an animated sequel of sorts that finds the offspring of Tom and Jerry continuing to play the cat-and-mouse game of hot pursuit. "Bobby's World," a live-action/animation entry about a 4-year-old boy (the voice of Howie Mandel) whose active imagination runs wild. "Attack of the Killer Tomatoes," an animated takeoff on the 1977 cult horror film spoof, featuring tomatoes striking

back against a world that has outlawed tomato products. "Piggies-Pigs," about the goings-on in a town populated entirely by pigs (the radiator-station's call letters are OINK). "Fox Fun House," a live-action game show of physical and mental challenges taking place inside a high-tech fun house.

NBC (premiering Saturday): "Camp Candy," about an animated character created in the image of comic actor John Candy who owns a camp.

"Captain N and the Adventures of Super Mario 3," an adventure hour based on characters from the popular Nintendo games. "Pigssee" (premiering on FOX): "Tom and Jerry Kids," the zany "Attack of the Killer Tomatoes," the zany "Piggies-Pigs," the off-center "Bobby's World" and "Fox Fun House."

Fox also hopes to build excitement for its Saturday morning schedule (and weekday afternoon cartoon series "Peter Pan and the Pirates") by enrolling viewers in a free-of-charge Fox Kids Club that sends members

mailing "a package of goodies and newsletters as well as the quarterly magazine 'Totally Kids.'"

Already, more than 2 million kids have reported signed up.

"We plan to listen to the kids who watch us and respond to their likes and dislikes in what we program," Loesch says.

Of course, Fox isn't the only network unveiling a new Saturday morning season this fall. It's merely the latest. NBC and top-rated ABC trot out their new and returning shows — like Fox — Saturday, while CBS goes on Sept. 15.

If there's any sort of trend afoot on the Saturday children's landscape, it would be the animated adventures of real-life stars. The once-such-shows-makes-them-dislike this season with NBC's "Camp Candy" (featuring the cartoon likeness of John Candy) and ABC's "Little Rascals" (starring a 10-year-old, animated Roseanne Barr).

NBC would also like to see another trend emerge — that of the successful live-action series. Of the networks, only NBC appears serious about trying new forms apart from the typical animated and semi-animated kiddie fare. Of its five hours of original Saturday morning programming this fall, two hours

Surprise hit 'Ghost' finishes summer in 1st place at box office

LOS ANGELES (AP) - "Ghost" Even though the season was littered with several big-ticket bombs, this summer was the second biggest in Hollywood history, with North American moviegoers spending about \$1.85 billion at the picture show.

Box-office analyst A.D. Murphy of the Hollywood trade paper Daily Variety said Tuesday that the summer grosses represent a decline of 9 percent from last summer's record of \$2.04 billion, but a 17 percent increase from the summer of 1988.

"Ghost" was one of the few films

this summer that had "legs" the ability to attract sustained business and repeat customers over several weeks. Seven films had more lucrative opening weeks than "Ghost": "Tom, Reilly," "Die Hard 2," "Dick Tracy," "Back to the Future Part III," "Another 48 HRS.," "Days of Thunder" and "Bird on a Wire."

In the end, though, business for all of these films declined while "Ghost" remained relatively steady. All the same, "Die Hard 2," "Dick Tracy" and "Dick Tracy" must be considered hits.

"Among the more surprise failures" this season was "Broke Back Mountain," which severely broke the historical mark. Paramount blamed the million mark. Paramount blamed the collapse of the Tom Cruise title on the historical unpopularity of race-car movies.

Disappointing returns were also reported by "Gremlin 2: The New Batch," "Ghost Dad," "Quick Change," "My Blue Heaven," "Cathaline Man," "Air America," "Fire Birds," "The Adventures of Ford Fairlane," "Haley's Wedding," "The Two Jakes" and "RoboCop 3."

Finishing behind "Ghost" for second place over the Labor Day weekend was the crime-suspense thriller "Darkman" on a gross of \$7.9 million. It was followed by the courtroom drama "Presumed Innocent," which made \$5.9 million.

The mid-summer thriller "Flatliners" finished fourth with \$5.2 million and Steve Martin's "The Darkman" on a gross of \$7.9 million. Sixth was Emilio Estevez's "Men at Work" with \$3.1 million, and the comedy "Taking Care of Business" was seventh on \$2.82 million.

The summer's top-10 films in order were: "Ghost," \$125 million; "Total Recall," \$116.7 million; "Die Hard 2," \$109.7 million; "Dick Tracy," \$103.7 million; "Back to the Future Part III," \$80.1 million; "Days of Thunder," \$78.0 million; "Another 48 HRS.," \$79.1 million; "Bird on a Wire," \$70 million; "Presumed Innocent," \$67.4 million; and "Arachnophobia," \$48.4 million.

"Pretty Woman" made \$59.5 million during the summer but was spring release, opening March 23.

Polish-born pop star Basia finds sudden success a little traumatic

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Nothing she did the past 10 years, Basia says, prepared her to become an overnight sensation.

There was the obligatory dues-paying of the years of belting out jingles for commercials, backing up other vocalists, singing for Top 40 groups in the United States and England. "Time and Tide," that seemed to go slowly but surely on a worldwide audience.

But then came a second hit album, "London-Warsaw-New York," and a frenetic world tour that has turned everything upside down.

Musical phenomenon

"I'm enjoying this tour so much now," she said. "We really have a good band. For the first time, every member of the group is exactly right. Everything just clicked this time."

"It wasn't always that easy. Bei-

coming an overnight sensation took a long time.

It started in the Polish industrial city of Jaworzno, where Basia grew up listening to Western music, everything from Charlie Parker to Prince, with Pink Floyd and Carol King on the side.

She started singing with an all-girl group while still in her teens, and left for London in 1981 to make a serious stab at a musical career. Her leaving, she says, allowed her to experience only from afar much of the economic and political turmoil her countrymen went through in the 1980s.

"I left just before martial law got introduced," she said in a voice that now contains a strong English accent.

"Before that, my life (in Poland) was pretty carefree and carefree. I remember that nothing really was missing in my life. We had enough to eat, we were comfortable. My parents had their own business producing ice cream... I had my mu-

and my friends."

She incorporated everything she heard into her own upbeat style, one that's heavy on jazz, pop, Latin rhythms and American rhythm and blues.

And just after her arrival in London, she met longtime collaborator Danny White, whose musical interests were equally broad. By the mid-1980s, the two decided it was time to strike out on their own. But that wasn't easy either.

"Danny kept encouraging me to write," she said. "He would give me a verse and I had to finish the rest of the song. It was something she hated."

"To shut him up, I finally just did

it, and we wrote a whole album that way."

The album was "Time and Tide" (1988), the first of her three studio albums. She has since sold 100,000 copies after its 1987 release. The record company was delighted, but she was disappointed because she was hoping for a gold record (for 500,000 copies sold). The LP just kept on selling, going gold in 1988 and platinum for 1 million albums sold the following year.

Then everything exploded. "London-Warsaw-New York" came out earlier this year and zoomed up the charts, going gold in three weeks. The small club dates from the last American tour quickly became huge concert-hall events. Following this summer's U.S. tour, there will be concerts in Japan. It's their back to the United States in the fall for more shows.

"The success has made her one of Poland's biggest stars.

"Now, when I tell my mum some-

thing, she's already seen it in the interview," she quipped.

"But her mother hasn't seen her perform in front of thousands yet. She's only seen her daughter's videos. So there will soon be a series of concerts in Poland, too."

"This is something that is very much new to me—it's important to me," Basia said. Family also is important, and she returns home several times a year. "When I'm there I get so sentimental and sorry that I just want to cry."

In fact, if success has a downside it is that it has kept her from starting her own family.

"This is something I miss the most," she said. "I envy people who have a stable family life. Career, it's one thing. But it's nothing compared to that. I really want it badly, and sometimes I'm afraid I won't get it. I didn't meet the right person yet. I'm afraid."

"But I'm still keeping my eyes open," she adds.

Hollywood hopes fall will put end to slump that has decreased box-office take by 12%

These construction crews parked outside the major Hollywood studios have their work cut out for them. They're trying to shore up and salvage what's left of 1990. So far, the first year of the new decade has proved unbelievably shaky.

Around most of empty hives, most of it surrounding "Tom Cruise's 'Days of Thunder' and box-office fizzes ("Another 48 HRS" and "Robocop 2" among them) the industry has decided to tuck in its chin, put its feet on the ground, and try to get a better sense of what's to come. But it's too late to come batting back from a 12 percent slump at the box-office in June, according to Variety, 40 million fewer people went to the movies than in the equivalent period in '89.

Not to mention any number of other factors that have hurt the industry. All of the top Oscar contenders, for starters. With the possible exception of Liam Neeson in "Wild at Heart," there haven't been enough decent female performers this year to put out its best actress. And best actor? An even bleaker situation. No one (with the possible exception of long-shot Jason Patric in "After Dark, My Sweet") leaps to mind.

If this performance drought continues, Oscar will have to hang out a sign reading "Canceled." Due to lack of interest? Thank goodness, then, for the old reliables, such as "A List" actors as Robert De Niro, Shirley MacLaine and Meryl Streep. Like the 7th Cavalry, they're about to come charging back to the front lines. The next wave of "Batman" superheroes.

In the months ahead, there will be 60-some movies from which to choose. They will carry such upbeat titles as "Postcards from the Edge," "Desperate Hours" and "White Nights." They will not, we say, be dripping with hope, reassurance and soft-focus sentiment. The opposite: They will gnaw at your conscience and attempt to undermine your already shaky sense of security. No less than six entries, including "Men" and "Night of the Living Dead—Remake," "Desperate Hours" and John Hughes' farcical "Home Alone" will show heathen and home under siege from escaped convicts, Michael Keaton's return from hell and high zombies. They will not, and winter months are traditionally a time of reflection. It was during December, remember, that we were introduced to "Last Emperor" and "Driving Miss Daisy," two prestige productions

that covered decades in the lives of their protagonists, and went on to score big on Oscar night.

Which means you had better lay in an extra store of popcorn and prepare yourself for longer, more complex scenarios. We're talking several generations of friendship and love that will again be big. Among these "Godfather"-type epics, look for "Mitter's Crossing," "Avaton," "Guogrenius" and, of course, the continuing saga of the Corleones, with Al Pacino back as an ailing, more philosophical Michael Corleone in Francis Coppola's \$40-million "The Godfather, Part III," due at Christmas. Martin Scorsese's "GoodFellas," co-starring De Niro and Ray Liotta, is subtitled "Three Decades of Life in the Mafia," and Barry Levinson's "Diner" ("In Men" present), "Avalon," traces 50 years of the director's sum of the century. Battlefield anxiety.

And conflict? Expect a roller coaster's worth of dips and hairpin curves as Hollywood again considers its big-screen choices. Will it be hot-and-heavy rendezvous ("White Palace," "Hot Spot") and gangland ambushes ("Miller's Crossing," "GoodFellas" and Britain's "The Krays"), comedic battles of wits ("Sibling Rivalry

and Woody Allen's full release, "Alice") or mother-daughter feuds (Streep vs. Shirley MacLaine in "Postcards," Cher vs. Winona Ryder in "Mermaids")?

And if these standoffs aren't enough, the industry has about a voyage into the troubled psyche to rescue the protagonist from himself? It's here that Vietnam vet Tim Robbins must confront his worst fears in "Jacob's Ladder" and Robin Williams must venture in search of De Niro's modern-day Rip Van Winkle in "Awakenings."

As for star power, Hollywood will risk overload with multiple appearances by Clint Eastwood, Shirley MacLaine, Danny Glover, Gene Hackman and Tom Selleck. De Niro and Winona Ryder will both come dangerously close to overexposure. Each has three vehicles due in the coming months.

To strike out, "Guilty by Suspicion" and "Awakenings" by Ryder in "Mermaids," "Edward Scissorhands" and "Welcome Home, Roxy Carmichael."

Also expect visits from Sean Connery and Michelle Pfeiffer ("The Russia House"), Prince ("Golfing with My Brother"), Albert Finney ("Miller's Crossing"), Jeff Bridges and Cybill Shepherd ("Texasville"), Matthew Modine ("Memphis Belle"), Chevy Chase and Dan Aykroyd (the Christmas release "Valentinian"), and, of course, Philadelphia's own Rocky Balboa in "Rocky V").

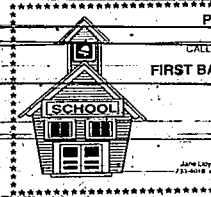

Music is still king for Cab Calloway

At 82, legendary singer keeps classic jazz alive

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Don't bring up all that legend stuff with Cab Calloway.

He's not in the mood. Yeah, he's been around. How many years now? Well, just 60 if you need a number. But that's not important.

What's important is the music. It's what keeps the 82-year-old "hi-de-ho" king on the road and away from his home in White Plains, N.Y., much of the year.

It doesn't matter what town he's in anymore. Just find a spot and a band and he'll be there. He was in Europe in the spring. He's been all over the United States this summer.

"It doesn't mean anything to me. It's just part of the routine," Calloway said when asked if he was looking forward to two recent performances at the Hollywood Bowl.

"If I wasn't here, I'd just be some place else this weekend."

Sound harsh? Perhaps, but after 60 years and the occasional bugs-bug him to admit it. One could tell by the awe-struck looks on the faces of the musicians when he glided out on stage during rehearsal, just like one of those old black-and-white film clips from the 1930s.

One could see it again when he sang "Minnie the Moocher" when he held that last note on "St. James Infirmary," longer than a human being ought to be allowed to, when he swayed and strutted around stage like some nimble tightrope walker.

Those moves have slowed a bit since the '30s, a time when Calloway could have danced Michael Jackson or Mick Jagger into the ground. And maybe the hair is white and thinner now, but the look is still there and the classically handsome face lined and puffy after eight decades of full-throttle living. But every bit of his voice is still there — and every bit of the style and grace that made the legend.

"I ask him who some of his own music legends are."

"Nobody," he answers tartly.

No, really.

"I don't know — it's been too long," he finally offers. As he does, he peers off into space as if to recall those wonderful days of his earlier career — those days of Louis Armstrong, Duke Ellington, Dizzy Gillespie, Lena Horne and others. He worked with them all.

"No, I'll tell you who my heroes are," he finally says, wheeling around to face his interviewer.

"My heroes are the notes, man. The music itself. You understand what I'm saying? I love the music. The music is my hero."

Indeed, Calloway who was born Cabell Calloway on Christmas Day in Rochester, N.Y., gave up a law career for music. His old Lincoln University classmate, Thurgood

Marshall, stayed in school and made quite a name for himself. Calloway says.

"Yeah," Calloway says, smiling at the memory. "I went to high school with him, too. He's a good old guy."

"I was studying law and I got involved in music, so I put the law career down for music."

"Any regrets?"

"Nah. But it wouldn't matter much now, would it?"

The music started in earnest sometime in the '20s, when he came a part-time singer in Baltimore, and joined an all-male quartet in the revue "Plantation Days."

"Really, I don't remember," Calloway laughs when pressed for more specifics. "I don't want to remember. It's been too many years to want to remember."

But it was in 1930, he concedes,

that he hooked up with another legend, Harlem's Cotton Club.

"They wanted a band to play the following Duke Ellington and they picked me," he said.

He took the fabled old nightclub by storm. Soon there were not only concerts but hit movies such as "Stormy Weather" and "Intimate Hour," and "Strut" on Broadway shows. He also found time to get married and have children. His daughter, Chris, is a singer who has performed with her father in recent years.

And always there was the music. One big band aggregation of brilliant musicians in the '40s reached the dressed-to-kill dandy, the wild, leaping, gyrating band leader with the unbelievable voice. They cranked out such hits as "The Jumpin' Jive," "Kester Man," "I Ain't Necessarily So." They used the musical styles that everybody else copied.

They first did "Minnie the Moocher" in 1931. More than a half-century later, people sing it all over the place. Even those who don't know they know it sing the chorus: "Hi-de-ho-ho-ho-ho. It needed a theme song, and I knew 'Minnie' would be a good one," Calloway says of the tune he wrote about the "lowdown hootchie kootchie with the heart as big as a whale." "It really doesn't mean anything."

But it made him the king of "hi-de-ho" and brought him success that didn't slow until the '50s. Even after that there were more movies and plays, but rock and other musical forms crowded aside the big bands.

Then the Blues Brothers came along. Comedians Dan Aykroyd and John Belushi took to the stage as cheap-suited, sullen-looking, crass rhythm and blues singers, mimicking the music they loved. When they put their act on the big screen as "The Blues Brothers" movie in 1980, Calloway went with them. He sang "Minnie the Moocher" and stole the show.

"I think a lot of the young people know," he says now. "They just didn't recognize me until 'The Blues Brothers' movie."

Now that they recognize him once again, he's in no mood to slow down. He'll perform for the public, he says. "Whenever they want me."

Home-video prices vary according to categories

Confused about the pricing of home videos?

So are a lot of people in the business. In a nutshell, here's the unwieldy way things stand:

• Most "A" movies (that is, big hits) are priced in the neighborhood of \$89.95 to \$100. At that price, the thinking is, buyers will be primarily video stores, which will make their money renting the tapes. At many stores, after the initial rental activity dies down, the used tapes are sold, sometimes for as little as \$10.

A relatively few "A" titles — those considered "repeatable" or "collectible" such as family or children's titles — are brought out at a much lower figure, usually \$20 to \$25. These are, in the parlance, priced for the "sell-through" market. They will also, of course, be available for rent.

• "B" titles — movies that never bite and in some cases never even released — are priced anywhere from \$40 to \$79.95. They are almost exclusively rental items.

• Non-movie titles — self-help, music, travelogues, exercise, and so forth — tend to rent poorly and are thus usually priced for self-through action. Most of them hover between \$14.95 and \$29.95, occasionally higher — as in the case of a nicely packaged opera or documentary.

• Movies on laser disc are priced significantly lower than their VHS tape counterparts, usually in the area of \$39.95.

Nearly all the movies issued in laser-disc format are either recent, popular "A" titles or older classics. And whereas the release of a movie made their money renting the tapes, on laser disc previously was often delayed a matter of months after its appearance on tape, the two formats are increasingly brought out simultaneously.

To crown the confusion, the price of a movie video frequently is lowered dramatically after the title has been on the market for a while. An "A" title that originally sold for \$25, for example, might be repriced at \$20 or priced for the "sell-through" market.

As the video business can be one of the slickest things in the world, said Kyle Wagner of Playtime Video in Avon, Conn. "Sometimes the garage can cost more than the good stuff."

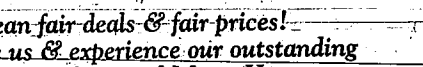

'The Jungle Book' offers a taste of what animation once was like

Classy-eyed parents who've just barely managed to survive the blithering inanities and visual banalities of "Jesons." The movie is hereby given the following advice: Go see "The Jungle Book" and remember what animation used to be. Live a little. You've earned it.

The 1967 Disney film is nowhere near the top of the Disney form, either classic old school or sleek new school, but it's actually traditional, but it is lively, witty, tenuous and completely involving.

Like many another Disney project, this one has its roots in literature. It is derived loosely from Rudyard Kipling's great stories of Mowgli, which were revised by authors in the wilderness of the Indian subcontinent, and if I were writing in 1967, I'd probably be making a big pro-

duction of how once again the huckster Disney had translated a great British sensibility and "fixing" it so that it can play in the American suburbs without a second thought.

Of course, that's all changed. Amusing isn't it, how in the '40s, '50s and '60s, critics used to dismiss Disney as a merchant of banalities who regularly looted and vandalized great art for commercial purposes? Yet now, in our debauched era, that same "commercial" work seems like highly classical accomplishment, particularly in comparison to our feeble epoch's feeble efforts.

In any event, "Jungle Book," rated G, follows the Beavertlike Mowgli (he looks like Jerry Mathers on a bad color TV) on his way out of the jungle when it is learned by his fa-

thers the wolves that Shere Khan the tiger, is back in the neighborhood. The dramatic tension is primitive: Innocent Mowgli can't imagine his death and wants to stay. The wise wolves insist that he leave for his own good. (Actually, the Disney artists could have done much more with the majesty and nobility of the wolves, who remain undeveloped.)

Mowgli's companions are a pantheon read by Sebastian Cabot and a hisper bear read by Phil Harris. In a wonderful bit of casting, the great ironic-cad and world-class rotter George Sanders reads Shere Khan, and the Disney artists have enormous fun getting nuances from

Sanders' great, sleazy bag of a face onto the tiger's ironic mug. The songs, not great, are nevertheless amusing as when orangutan played as Neomid, in a bit of one-racial-enlightenment ugliness manage to boogie-woogie so frenetically to the beat of the tomtoms that they tear down the temple they have taken over as a home. And Harris has a very nice little number called "The Bare Necessities" where his whiskey-nubbed, smoke-choked hipster's growl is fun more resonant than the pristine imagery.

This universe, of course, is deathless and basically unsaveable: It is the jungle-as-60s suburb.

'Total recall': Big on violence, special effects

The following are capsule reviews of movies now showing in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and the Los Angeles Times. Opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

Capsule reviews

TOTAL RECALL (R)—Extraordinarily violent, top-heavy with its huge budget and special effects, this large-scale adaptation of Philip K. Dick's "I Can Remember It for You Wholesale" — about a dull earthing who freaks out after a memory transplant and becomes imagines he is a secret agent involved in a Martin Scorsese-style, big action affair.

Part of it is a standard-issue Armin Schwarzenegger vehicle; part, a ribald comedy of psychosis, like director Paul Verhoeven's previous "The Fourth Man." Which part you enjoy, or dislike, is a matter of temperament.

AIR AMERICA (R)—Roger Spottiswoode's high-style black comedy about the covert CIA airlift operation in S.E. Asia during the Vietnam War. It's often incoherent in its combination of surreal landscapes and "MASH"-style pranks, but the script finds its focus too late. The film is scaled too big for the tinkery ironies you're left with. Mel Gibson and Robert Downey star.

ARACHNOPHOBIA (PG-13)

For a movie that plans to scare the kapok out of us, Frank Marshall's funny-scary primal scream of a comedy is a friendly and neatly witty effort, technically, it's a wonder. It is the classic form, done on a grander scale: the blob-Marian spider from far, far away that very nearly wipes out the perfect American small town. On the other hand, we have a very contemporary here (a truly humorous left-Daniels) — um, mucho enough to yell to his kids, "We need Mom in here to kill a spider."

DARKMAN (R)—It's thinly plotted, predictable, garishly over-violent. But it's the best of all the recent comic book movies — indeed, the only one that really captures the look, feel and skewed-angle style of comics. Director Sam Raimi ("The Evil Dead") and his crew lavish prodigious visual gifts on this movie: a simple "origin" tale, with "Count of Monte-Cristo" overtones, in which a horribly disfigured scientist (Liam Neeson), who can change his face at will, seeks revenge on the criminal venem (including surgically vicious Larry Drake) who destroyed his life.

FLATLINERS (R)—Some lines shouldn't be crossed; some movies shouldn't be watched. No, that's too

easy. This Joel Schumacher film, in which five psychotic med students decide to experience death and afterlife — scientifically — is — eminently watchable, gloriously aflame with swanky deep-focus decor. But it's built around the kind of spiritually hucksteric silliness that L. Muncie's theme is like a little dry pea rattling through the vast, echoing museum of the high-tech images. Why should anyone risk death to see the afterlife depicted here, when they can get the same stuff by subscribing to *Rolling Stone*?

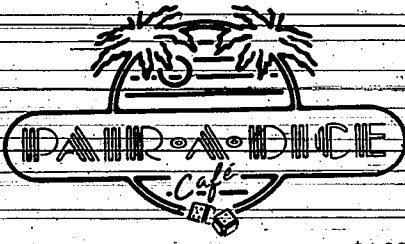
GHOST (PG-13)—The movie's slogan is "Believe," not an unreasonable request. But even those who'd be happy to comply must get past a certain woolly-mindedness to its script and a production prettified of its actors — Demi Moore as the desolate lover; Whoopi Goldberg as an extremely reluctant spirit go between and Vincent Schiavelli as an irascible, sub-way-dwelling ghost — things are in the best hands possible. But Patrick Swayze as a corporate New York banker never in permitting corporate years.

PRESUMED INNOCENT (R)—A solid guy, an enthralling drama, part who-dunit, part moral dilemma, ner-

fectly cast and performed brilliantly by — but especially by Harrison Ford, Bonnie Bedelia and Paul Winfield. Scott Turvey's fans will be pleased to know that screenwriter Frank Pierson and the film's director, Alan J. Pakula, have made an uncommonly sensitive adaptation of what's been called a "dull but a big book."

PUMP UP THE VOLUME (R)—By day, a mild-mannered Arizona student, by night a pirate radio Super Shock Rock broadcasting from his own bedroom, Christian Slater, doing another of his Jack Nicholson turns — gives Allan Moyle's teen-drama some insinuating pizzazz, but the movie isn't up to its own brave premise.

'Daring' is the word at CBS this season as network tries to get out of basement

As the upcoming 1990-91 television season begins, CBS, firmly entrenched in the ratings basement, seems to be approaching it with daring. Why not? With NBC and ABC locked in a dogfight for No. 1, CBS has nothing to lose by trying out some new wings.

One of the new shows on the CBS schedule is "Uncle Buck" (Mondays). Based on the hit 1989 feature film, the half-hour comedy is about an uncouth, somewhat sloppy uncle who becomes the guardian of his brother's three children. The series is up against another promising new series, NBC's "Fresh Prince of Bel Air," and ABC's "MacGyver," but as the lead-in for "Major Dad," "Murphy Brown" and "Designing Women," all solid performers, "Uncle Buck" just might stick around.

An interesting CBS offering, which may be doomed by its time slot opposite NBC's "The Cosby Show" and Fox's "The Simpsons," is "The Flash." The one-hour comic-strip-based drama is about a scientist who comes out of a lab accident with superhuman speed, which he uses to battle crime.

CBS is also premiering "Lemmy" (Wednesdays), a sitcom about a blue-collar family; "WIOU" (Wednesdays), about the fiscally constrained news team at a big-city television station; and "E.A.R.T.H. Force" (Saturdays), about a team of environmentalists.

ABC is approaching the season like a general laying siege. The network is only presenting six new

series, but with the momentum that is already strong, those six created radical change in the fall.

The network's most daring move is "Cop Rock" (Wednesdays), an hour-long show that is part police drama, part rock opera. It sounds like a strange concept, and it is. The odd mix of music and drama is sometimes successful and sometimes embarrassing.

"Gabriella Fire" (Thursdays) is the ace of ABC's new shows. James Earl Jones stars as an ex-cop who gets out of jail on a technicality after 20 years, originally sentenced to life for killing a fellow cop. Jones' character is a tainted hero who must acquaint himself with life on the outside.

For its part, No. 1 NBC is striving to maintain its top standing with nine new series. Comedy figures

heavily in the new schedule, but the network is also gambling with a new reality-based show called "Lifestories." Each week, the one-hour Sunday-night series, which is narrated by Robert Prosky, presents a different story about a serious disease from the viewpoint of the patient. It's not always uplifting, but it is fresh.

"Fresh Prince of Bel Air" (Mondays) is the best bet of the NBC schedule. The oil-and-water mix of a Philadelphia teen who is transplanted to the home of his rich relatives is the most contemporary of any this season's crop.

NBC came out on the top of the heap as 'Heat of the Night' was the hot one

LOS ANGELES (AP) — NBC was the big winner in the latest network ratings battle, capturing seven of the top 10 shows on television.

The victory also marked NBC's 16th consecutive week as the top-rated network, according to figures released Wednesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

Own ratings showed NBC far ahead with a 10.6 average. CBS placed second with 9.8, and ABC was last with 8.7.

Each ratings point represents 931,000 households.

The latest rankings show a marked difference from the two preceding weeks, when interest in the Persian Gulf crisis helped CBS news magazine, '60 Minutes' win unprecedented, back-to-back No. 1 victories.

Sunday's show contained no updates on the Persian Gulf. '60 Minutes', spokesman Roy Brunett said the drop-off in viewers was caused by Labor Day travelers.

"I think the biggest reason was that it was a holiday weekend, Brunett said. "People just weren't watching television."

In the latest standings, '60 Minutes' plummeted to a two-way
