Baghdad threatens terror use

Iraq warned Thursday of possible terrorist attacks against U.S. forces, sounding the theme of Arab feelings wounded by the presence of non-Muslim soldiers massed in the holy lands of Saudi Arabia.

But a condemnation of Muslim clergy in Mecca, Saudi Arabia, condemned the Iraqi annexation of Kuwait and said the U.S.-led multinational force's presence was justified by Iraq's invasion.

In another development, the U.S. commander in Saudi Arabia said the flow of equipment for American forces into Saudi Arabia was eight days behind schedule. The commander, though, said the troops and military hardware already there were sufficient enough to stop any Iraqi attack.

Iraq's warning came in a memorandum to the U.S. charge d'affaires in Baghdad, according to the Iraqi News Agency, monitored in Nicosia, Cyprus. It said Iraq was responding to a U.S. claim that Iraq-based terrorists were preparing to attack U.S. targets.

The United States is creating a "pretext" for aggression, the memorandum was quoted as saying, and "Iraq reserves its legitimate right to self-defense, to reciprocate and to retaliate firmly against those parties if it becomes a target."

"President Bush should expect that the crimes—the United States of America is committing against the Arab nation and the insult it is directing to the Islamic shrines by occupying holy lands will undoubtedly provoke a natural reaction from the Arab and Islamic masses," said the memorandum.

Video message on way to Iraq

WASHINGTON—President Bush plan to communicate with the Iraqi people through a video message, a source said, setback Thursday when the Iraqi ambassador refused to accept a copy of the tape.

After receiving assurances from the ambassador that the tape would be shown on a "better procedure" was found for delivering it, the State Department decided to send a courier to Baghdad.

"With cameras recording the scene Thursday morning, Deputy Secretary of State Lawrence Eagleburger tried to give the eight-minute tape to Ambassador Mohamed al-Masbat.

Later, speaking with reporters, al-Masbat said his complaint with the form of delivery—not the substance of the tape, which is designed to enable Bush to tell his side of the Persian Gulf crisis to the Iraqi people.

"We welcome the tape," al-Masbat said, adding that he assured Eagleburger that the Iraqi government will broadcast the statement "in prime time."

Al-Masbat also raised the possibility that his government might broadcast the tape via satellite "for the whole world."

Later, State Department deputy spokesman Richard Boucher said the eight-minute tape, which was broadcast late in its entirety during prime time, is a significant step.

He said al-Masbat had assured him a visa was being given to a State Department courier who was to leave for Baghdad with the tape Thursday afternoon.



'Massive greenhouse effect' on neighbor planet

TWIN FALLS—The planet Venus may hold the key to breaking the world's dependence on oil.

Astronomer Carl Sagan, speaking to more than 100 people at the College of Southern Idaho Thursday, pointed out that the planet is barren, lifeless and a generally hot place because "there is a massive greenhouse effect on Venus."

Recent discoveries have given us lessons for everyday life, Sagan said, es-

pecially for a planet addicted to fossil fuels.

Every lump of coal burned, every gallon of gas puts carbon dioxide in the air," Sagan said. Doubters of the greenhouse effect need look no farther than Venus, which has lots of carbon dioxide and surface temperatures of 500 degrees Fahrenheit.

Sagan said temperatures projected for earth during the year 2020 will be the hottest in 150,000 years, bringing on widespread drought and higher ocean levels. That's a result of the greenhouse

effect—caused by increased carbon dioxide levels in the atmosphere that will trap heat.

But those insights on the impact of man's actions on the global environment are only possible because of unmanned-space exploration.

"If all you care about are practical things on earth, then you should be for robotic exploration," Sagan said.

Sagan is a Pulitzer Prize-winning book author and astronomer. He is best known for the television series "Cosmos," which

McClure blocks mining law changes

WASHINGTON—Sen. Dale Bumpers of Arkansas has decided to abandon until next year his battle to change a 118-year-old mining law.

"Instead, aides say, he will try for a one-year moratorium on new government patents for mining claims. Bumpers will attempt to attach the moratorium to the Interior Department appropriations bill, expect-

ed to be discussed by the House and Senate next week.

"The reason for the dropped fight? Sen. James McClure, R-Idaho, who has vehemently opposed changes in the law, will have retired after three terms.

The Arkansas Democrat—also a three-term—has tried for more than a year to alter the 1872 Mining Act, which allows prospectors to buy public land for \$2.50 an acre. If they intend to look for hard-rock minerals, claims are patented by the Bu-

reau of Land Management after the agency determines the land contains minerals.

Bumpers' bill, dubbed the Mining Act of 1989, would place an 8 percent royalty on mining production, and would impose a holding fee of \$100 per claim, plus a \$50-an-acre "diligence" fee on the property.

In the House, Rep. Nick Rahall, D-W.Va., has introduced a bill requiring claimholders pay the government \$1.50 an acre annually, which would increase to \$5.

Souter says there's a right to privacy; silent on abortion

WASHINGTON—In calm and measured tones, Supreme Court nominee David H. Souter said Thursday that the Constitution grants a right of privacy, but he reportedly refused to say whether that right encompasses a woman's decision to terminate her pregnancy.

Testifying during the first day of confirmation hearings on his nomination to become the 10th justice at a pivotal time in the high court's history, Souter said it would be "inappropriate" for him to comment on "the one case which has been on everyone's lips since the moment of my nomination."

He referred to Roe vs. Wade, the bitterly controversial 1973 landmark that gave

women a privacy right to choose abortion in the early state of pregnancy without government interference.

A Texas rights leader, who have challenged Souter's candidacy without openly opposing it, said they remained dissatisfied but would await further questioning of Souter by Senate Judiciary Committee members Friday and Monday before taking a position.

"This is about the lives and health of millions of women but, he quickly drew the wall (of silence) down," complained Kate Mitchell, executive director of the National Abortion Rights Action League.



Fire hits Soviet nuclear plant

MOSCOW — An explosion and fire hit a plant in Soviet Central Asia that produces fuel for nuclear power stations, spewing toxic gas into the air before the blaze was extinguished, it was reported Thursday.

No one was killed, although several people were injured by the blast and fire, which occurred Wednesday at the Ulbinsky metallurgical plant in the city of Ust-Kamenogorsk, the Tass news agency reported.

The city in the republic of Kazakhstan is about 105 miles east of Semipalatinsk, where the Soviet Union conducts its nuclear weapons tests. Toxic gas filled the streets of the city, dissipating slowly because of the calm winds, the government newspaper Izvestia reported Thursday.

West German leaders greet Reagan

BONN, West Germany — Former President Reagan was warmly welcomed by West German leaders Thursday in a city where large crowds once protested his visits.

On this historic hour when German unity is becoming reality it is right that you, a great friend of our country, are here," Chancellor Helmut Kohl told Reagan, who is on a 10-day trip with scheduled stops in Poland, the Soviet Union and Italy.

Gangs massacre S. African commuters

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa — Youths with spears and machetes went on a rampage Thursday in a black commuter train, hacking to death at least 26 people and injuring about 100 as terrified passengers leaped from the speeding coaches.

Police gave no reason for the attack, which came after black faction fighting left at least 15 other people dead Thursday in townships around Johannesburg. Another gang of men waiting for the train when it pulled into the next stop about five minutes later began shooting and stabbing the screaming passengers as they tried to flee.

Swiss reportedly have to eat explosives

BERN, Switzerland — The Defense Ministry on Thursday launched an inquiry into practices at an army training center after it was revealed that recruits had been forced to eat explosives.

The ministry confirmed newspaper reports that up to 20 young soldiers were taken to hospital center this week after swallowing 30 grams of explosives in what was described as a regular initiation ceremony. One person killed himself and six others attempted suicide.

Germans, Soviets sign friendly accord

MOSCOW — West Germany and the Soviet Union initiated a landmark treaty Thursday intended to eliminate long-standing distrust between the Soviets and Germany as the powerful new German nation emerges.

The document is also intended as the cornerstone for German help for the battered Soviet economy. Already, West Germany has pledged to give the Soviets \$7.6 billion to help cover the withdrawal of Soviet troops from East Germany. Another \$1.9 billion will be contributed in the form of a low-interest loan from Bonn.

Militia officer murdered in Lebanon

BEIRUT, Lebanon — Gunmen on Thursday murdered a Lebanese militia officer who led a squad of bodyguards assigned to protect Antigien Church envoy Terry Yaqub while he negotiated for the release of Western hostages.

Amin Sleib, 36, a senior officer of Druse warrior Walid Jumblatt's Progressive Socialist Party, was shot in the head, neck and chest, a police spokesman said.

Gorbachev aide seeks emergency measures

MOSCOW (AP) — A top adviser to Mikhail S. Gorbachev called Thursday for creation of an emergency council with power to step decades of Communist central planning and switch to a market economy.

Nikolai Y. Petrakov, the president's assistant for economic affairs, said the council would coordinate a 500-day radical reform program throughout the country.

However, the economic package — called the shatalin plan for its principal author, economist Stanislav S. Shatalin — would in theory transfer most economic control from the central government to the 15 republics.

EAST BERLIN (AP) — Struggling to get through its final days, East Germany's first free government faced new charges Thursday that it still contains the most hated remnants of the old regime.

Odiaga remanded to care of Corrections Department

HAILEY—Because he poses a danger to society, Mitchell John Odiaga will be placed in the custody of the Department of Corrections for care and treatment, a judge ruled Thursday.

The decision to send Odiaga to the Idaho Security Medical Facility, as opposed to committing him to Health and Welfare Department's custody, occurred on Odiaga's 16th birthday. Blaine County Prosecutor Ned Williamson said.

Fifth District Judge James J. May sent Odiaga to the Boise facility for up to 90 days, unless he is deemed competent to stand trial before then.

Odiaga was indicted in July in connection with the shooting deaths of two people in Ketchum in June. The shooting spree

also left a third person injured. The Boise man is charged with two counts of first-degree murder, one count of attempted first-degree murder and three counts of aggravated assault.

After examining Odiaga, a state psychiatrist and a state psychologist concurred that Odiaga is unfit to stand trial because he does not understand the proceedings against him and cannot assist in his defense.

In a letter to the court, Dr. Michael B. Estess called Odiaga "actively psychotic." He said Odiaga may have a personality disorder and that he may be a substance or alcohol abuser. He recommended Odiaga be confined and treated.

Williamson, who declined to contest the psychiatric finding, said he is disappointed that proceedings have been suspended.

BLM seeks to restore range in juniper desert

OAKLEY—Tortured mountain shrubs and trees creak under the weight of two bulldozers that grow through stubby juniper trees, dragging a piece of anchor chain between them.

A Bureau of Land Management crew is trying to turn a juniper stand south of Oakley back into the productive range land it once was. The bulldozers will drag their chain across about 500 acres in five sections.

The clanking smoke-belching beasts crunch through trees and the heavy chain—with pieces of railroad track welded to it—wrenches others from the ground. Wispis of dust and diesel smoke drift on the breeze over the blasted juniper stand.

The shattered, uprooted trees reveal only dust and rocks. Not much else grows in this juniper desert. What little grass does manage to survive is grazed off by livestock during a three-week period in the spring.

Once they have been uprooted, some of the trees will be stacked up and burned. Others will be left in piles for wildlife. The area will then be reseeded

with grasses, small plants and shrubs. Historically grass grew tall in this area interspersed with sagebrush and juniper. Ranchers once report up to three tons of hay per acre.

Periodically—about every 20 to 30 years—a fire burned over the area; but the grass bounced back quickly. The sagebrush and juniper took a little longer.

But after the first livestock arrived, cattle and sheep cropped the grass and fires rarely swept through the area. What fires did get junipers were put out quickly, giving the junipers a chance to get established.

"I'm sure this started occurring when grazing first became established," said Dave Shunsud, a range conservationist with the BLM's Budley Office.

"They've established such a dense stand there's no understorey," he said. With the grass to carry fires from one tree to the next, fire doesn't spread through the juniper stands.

"They almost become fireproof," said Roy Neiwert, range supervisor with the Forest Service's Twin Falls Ranger District.

Once established, junipers—

Airport gets reprieve on date for fire protection

HAILEY—"Slack" season in Sun Valley has provided Blaine County Airport Commission with more time to come up with a way to provide necessary firefighting services for commercial flights using the airport.

For the time being, commercial flights will continue to fly into Hailey.

County may take abandoned gas station for taxes

TWIN FALLS—Tests of an abandoned gasoline station near Filer showed no evidence of leaks from underground tanks and it might become Twin Falls County property soon.

The owner has not paid taxes on the station since 1986, leaving it open for Twin Falls County to foreclose. County Commissioner Marvin Hempleman said in July the commission did not want the property because assuming ownership could make the county liable for cleanup costs if the underground tanks leak.

But Hempleman said a local engineering firm contacted the commission recently and said it had tested the soil and found

no traces of gas around the tanks.

An employee at FHM Engineering, Gary Burkett, said the firm tested the soil around the tanks last year at the request of a man who considered buying the property.

Burkett said no traces of gas were found in the soil, but warned that does not prove the tanks don't leak.

"I would certainly recommend that before anybody bought the property, they test the tanks," Burkett said.

The local government requires that the soil surrounding taking underground gas tanks be removed and transported to a site that stores toxic waste.

Officials seek new road funding sources

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Eastern Idaho officials are urging state lawmakers to consider new sources of revenue, including a property tax on vehicles, to provide the huge sums of money needed to pay for the estimated \$7.3 billion backlog of road and bridge work throughout Idaho.

Raising the current 18-cent-gallon fuel tax, the primary source of cash for highway work now, is the obvious option for the special legislative committee looking into the problem.

"Another nickel of gasoline tax would be peanuts compared with what the oil companies have stuck us with," Butte County Commissioner Herman Aikele told the panel at its latest hearing on the issue Wednesday.

House Transportation Chairman John Session of Driggs, the committee's co-chairman, said he believed that tax would remain the primary

source in the future.

But city and county officials, faced with disappearing federal funds and deteriorating roads and bridges, argued that a variety of options should be considered. They included:

- Imposing an annual vehicle property tax similar to those levied by some neighboring states, where the levies range from \$20 to \$225.
- Allocating to local governments money in the state's \$35 million "intercity" fund.
- Allowing local governments optional taxing authority to deal with their own road problems.
- Dedicating 1 percent of the state sales tax to transportation needs.
- "We've got to find an alternative measure of funding," said Fremont County Commissioner Jim Sandwell.

Jim Sandwell is charged with determining just how bad the work backlog is and what would be the

best way to finance it. But Sessions said he does not believe the state can raise the billions of dollars a study issued earlier this year said was needed over the next six years.

As of last April, the Transportation Department estimated that there were over 400 miles of primary highway and more than 300 miles of secondary highway in eastern Idaho that needed pavement or surface repairs "as soon as possible," Transportation Board member John Combo of Idaho Falls said.

The department's current highway program includes projects aimed at fixing only 72 miles of the primary system and 11 miles of the secondary system, he said.

"The current funding levels, it will take 20 to 25 years to correct the approximate 600 miles of remaining highway with high-priority deficiencies," he said.

SNF trail closure sparks heated debate

IDAHO FALLS — Hikers and off-road vehicle enthusiasts squared off in an emotional hearing Thursday night over a Forest Service plan to close some trails in the proposed Boulder-White Clouds Wilderness and the Smoky Mountains to motorized traffic.

"All of the trails that are open to hikers are open to hikers," said Bill Summers of Council, arguing that nothing is being taken away from hikers under the proposal while whole trails would be off-limits to motorized travelers.

"But singer-songwriter, Carol King-Sorensen, a Custer County resident, contended that off-road vehicle groups are being used by industry as a way to exploit national forests.

Thursday night—Those have been the subjects of previous hearings. Steve Jones of Twin Falls closing the agency that caused trails to off-road vehicle use would mean heavier motorized vehicle use on other trails. He urged the Forest Service to spread out the impact by leaving the trails that are slated for closure open or opening trails to off-road vehicle elsewhere.

Mel Quale of Twin Falls suggested the Forest Service considering Little Boulder-Trail in the Smoky Mountains to motorized traffic as a compromise to closing the Germania Creek Trail.

Lee Morrow of Idaho Falls warned the Forest Service that closing the trails to motorized travel now would necessitate drafting an environmental impact statement—a lengthy process that requires hearings and studies—to reopen them later on.

"Non-motorized and motorized don't work together," she said. "Nearly 300 people attended the hearing at Wood River High School, the 11th in a series of sessions held by the Forest Service to get comments on the proposed travel plan for the Sawtooth National Forest. Much of the discussion centered on plans to close the 4th of July Creek and Germania Creek trails in the proposed Boulder-White Clouds Wilderness.

Ed Bloedel, recreation and lands staff officer for the SNF, said rumors that the Forest Service is planning to close the whole forest to snowmobiling and off-road vehicle use are unfounded.

The Forest Service representatives declined to discuss proposed trail changes in the Twin Falls and Burley ranger districts.

The comments from the 11th hearing will be considered as the Forest Service drafts its final plan, which is due by the end of the year. Unless there is an appeal, the changes will go into effect next spring.

The agency will make public comments until Oct. 1. Those comments should be addressed to Cathy Hardy, Sawtooth National Forest, 2647 Kimberly Road, Twin Falls.

"I would rather be going to trial, but I made the decision, reluctantly, not to contest the finding," Williamson said. "It is my hope and belief he will be found competent in the 90-day period."

Odiaga's attorney, Blaine County Public Defender Brian Elkins, said "it would be inappropriate to guess whether his client could be treated and found competent in the next three months."

"We have felt from the outset that the issue of competency was a very

critical issue, so we are very pleased with the court's decision," he said.

Neither Williamson nor Elkins could say how Odiaga will be treated. Elkins did say that the judge agreed to have a stay and a psychiatrist of Odiaga's choice treat him together.

Doctors at any time during the 90-day commitment can declare Odiaga competent and proceedings can go forward, Williamson said.

If Odiaga is not found competent when that time expires, he can be committed to the Department of Corrections

for another 180 days.

If doctors still don't find Odiaga competent to stand trial after that six-month period, Odiaga can be involuntarily committed for up to three years, Williamson said.

But the charges against him will wait, and so will Odiaga's attorney. "As long as he's facing first-degree murder charges, we intend to have a vigorous defense," Elkins said.

Odiaga will probably be taken to Boise on Monday, Elkins said.

the instruction and training of aviation firefighters, said people using the airport expect the airport to provide adequate fire and rescue coverage with competent and very quick responders.

their root systems that go down 30 to 40 feet into the ground — crowd out everything. An average juniper 10 to 12 feet tall uses 30 gallons of water a day.

The canopy of the trees intercepts moisture, keeping most of it from reaching the ground.

"If you remove the juniper and get grass growing, you double the water supply," Sjastad said. Other streams that have gone dry will return, he said.

"Public land officials refer to the process of juniper encroachment as 'desertification.' As the junipers gradually take over, they crowd out other plants. And as the diversity of the vegetation disappears, so does the animal diversity.

"The juniper itself makes a desert," Melven said.

With bare ground beneath the

trees, what moisture does reach the ground often just runs off. Recently, during a rain storm, Oakley road was washed out by the unimpeded runoff where the rain fell on the junipers.

Continued grazing, however, has only strengthened the juniper grip on the land. Nothing grows beneath these crooked evergreens.

"My opinion is that grazing activities have prevented the underground to build up enough to carry a fire," Newert said.

The chaining project, once completed and reseeded, will help prevent soil erosion, establish wildlife habitat and grow "cow feed" and

"wildlife food."

The increased forage and existing water system also will help keep cattle out of sensitive streams bottoms, Sjastad said.

The chaining process costs about \$52 per acre, which ranchers who graze their livestock in the area pay about 40 percent. Because of the lack of grass and shrub undergrowth, it can't be burned, he said.

Once the grass is reestablished, the BLM will keep the junipers in check, with periodical prescribed burns.

"You can't just walk away from it," Sjastad said.

Attorney general candidates muddy each other's image

When the two contenders in Idaho's Attorney General race accuse each other of being too beholden to special interests, they leave the uncomfortable impression that both accusations are right.

That's the problem with campaign mud-slinging. Everyone gets dirty, and voters are left to feel ever more cynical about politicians in general.

That appears to be what has happened in the race between Pat Kole and Larry Echohawk.

He waffles, he waffles, but gives the clear impression he would not prevent reservation gambling, despite the clear intent to the contrary of both Idaho legislators and citizens.

Equally troublesome in the same view, was Echohawk's inability to identify some of the contributors whose donations had been challenged by Cole.

His attitude was that he didn't know who all those people were — and didn't need to know because no contribution would ever identify him to the contributor.

Kole, the Republican, accuses Echohawk of relying too heavily on campaign money from out-of-state individuals and groups.

Echohawk, the Democrat, accuses Kole of relying too heavily on Idaho corporations — mostly wood-products outfits.

And each offers roughly the same defense: Whatever contributions I accept won't affect my performance as attorney general.

But on the other side, Kole is not much more reassuring. Echohawk has a good point when he says Kole has raised the donation issue because Kole's own financial backing comes from timber companies, who have an obvious interest in Idaho land and legal issues.

Kole's position on wilderness designation (no "unacceptable impact" on industry, whatever that means) suggests that his ideas are closely aligned with those of the timber and mining industries.

The issue begs the crucial question: If that's really the case, then why are wealthy donors and special interests so eager to pour money into what has to be, from a national perspective, a relatively obscure contest in a small state?

Of the two candidates, Echohawk's out-of-state financial backing is more apparent. He acknowledges being backed by Democratic Party Bohkrolers at the national level, and by groups and individuals nationwide who would like to see a Native American hold a statewide office somewhere in America.

Again, there's nothing specifically wrong with that. It just raises a question about his loyalties.

Kole, unlike Echohawk, says he screens all his contributions.

He won't accept money from anyone in litigation with the state or with litigation pending. And he won't take a gift if it's apparent that the giver will want some special favor.

Echohawk has, in fact, sought out such support, in effect telling national interests that his Indian identity is a reason they should support his race.

Increased minority representation in political office is a laudable goal. But the ties and donations raise questions about where Echohawk's loyalties will lie, and whose agenda he will pursue.

Given such support, it is a legitimate question to ask how Echohawk will represent and protect Idaho's interests when they conflict with those of Indian tribes, on such issues as reservation gambling, water rights and fisheries.

Those criteria are important, but they are riddled with loopholes. They offer small comfort — a fact that Kole seems to realize.

"There's a slippery slope and we've drawn a line that I've found defensible," he told us last week. "I think we've done a better job than my opponent." Maybe so, but not much better.

The race for Idaho's attorney general position is "an important one," as the state's chief legal officer, the attorney general, must be both advocate and fair representative, free of bias and taint; and answerable, in the purest sense, to the people.

The heavy-duty interests that have lined up behind Echohawk and to a lesser extent Kole do not inspire much confidence that a pure representation is what Idaho is likely to get.



Year-round schools economical

In order to provide a child the most effective school experience possible, the Twin Falls School Board should consider year-round education. The year-round school is designed to make maximum use of school facilities and to provide a frame-work whereby a school's overall effectiveness can be significantly increased.

During the past several weeks, months and years, people have raised concerns regarding the need to improve upon traditional educational practices. Therefore, YRE is viewed as providing a framework whereby many educational reforms can occur. YRE is not only possible for the school system to become more cost effective but it provides the opportunity and necessity of the implementation of a successful YRE program depends greatly on the support from district personnel, parents and students. This is no less important than are such practical matters as having adequate physical facilities.

Year-round education is considered by many patrons and educators as the most educationally sound and economically feasible solution to existing problems of the public school system. It meets a growing demand from taxpayers and educators for more efficient use of school materials, equipment and facilities. Senate panel urged to OK water rights deal

WASHINGTON (AP) — A Senate subcommittee on Thursday was urged to endorse legislation who introduced the bill Friday. The legislation would call for the historic agreement outlining the water rights of the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes on the Fort Hall Indian Reservation. Deputy state Attorney General Clive Strong said the water and power subcommittee of the Senate should endorse the agreement, which would give the tribes certain rights to ground water, stream water and flood water with procedures for phasing in total tribal claims to meet the Shoshone-Bannock needs without serious disruption to non-Indian users in the Upper Snake River Basin.

Idaho's retiring senior Sen. James McClure, who introduced the bill Friday, said the agreement is a creative resolution of what could have become a very divisive fight. "It's clear that the strength behind this agreement is the balance that has been struck for all of the parties involved," McClure said. The negotiated settlement allots the tribes just over \$81,000 acre-feet of water a year along with \$22 million from the federal government for the development and acquisition of grazing rights and land near Grays Lake that would help protect the area.

Opposition of the unprecedented, basin-wide adjudication of all water rights that is nearly 10 years into its 10-year life. McClure said that if the water rights had been handled in Indian claims have been elsewhere, there would have been no guarantee that other uses would be protected. Strong pointed out to the subcommittee that unless other proposed water agreements, all affected federal agencies have endorsed the Shoshone-Bannock deal, the tribes and the private water users in the area. "If nothing else," he said, "the fact that all of these parties support the agreement demonstrates that it is fair and equitable to all parties."

GOP candidate Kole unveils anti-drug plan

BURLEY (AP) — Republican Pat Kole has endorsed a plan to toughen the mandatory minimum sentencing for drug traffickers and expanding the ability of prosecutors to try accused juvenile drug pushers as adults. "Several of these proposals are aimed at those who sell drugs to our children," the attorney general candidate said Thursday in joining Sen. Denton Darrington, R-Deerlodge, to outline the anti-drug strategy. "That type of conduct is reprehensible, and mandates a strict response."

by our criminal justice system," Kole said. In addition to backing the mandatory minimum sentencing plan that was rejected during the last legislative session, Kole and Darrington called for suspending driver's licenses of those convicted of misdemeanor drug and alcohol violations and turning state financial aid to local law-enforcement officials to properly dispose of seized illegal substances. "These proposals will demonstrate our continued resolve to win the war on drugs," Darrington said. "The seriousness of the drug problem demands tougher measures."

Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus and Attorney General Jim Jones have both asked lawmakers to impose mandatory minimum sentences on drug traffickers. But while Darrington was able to strip a five-year mandatory minimum proposal through the Senate, it was rejected by the House Judiciary Committee. Critics maintained the mandatory sentences ignore special circumstances that can be involved and diminishing the ability of the judge to tailor any penalty to individual situations. Lawmakers eventually approved legislation providing a fixed five-year prison term at the judge's discretion.

That legislation also allowed juveniles accused of selling drugs or near schools to be tried as adults. The plan Kole and Darrington proposed would expand that provision to include any juvenile accused of selling drugs in any circumstance, and it would impose the mandatory minimum sentence on repeat drug trafficking offenders, those who sell drugs to minors or induce minors to sell drugs and those selling drugs on school buses. But Kole, who faces Bannock County Democratic Prosecutor Larry E. Beck's challenge in November, said the proposal to expand the ability of prosecutors to try all accused juvenile drug traffickers as adults would require serious study because of the potential ramifications.

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — A state official monitoring local air quality said "blatant disregard for environment and health" by field-burning grass farmers resulted in Coeur d'Alene's smokiest day of the year. Terry Christianson, an Idaho Division of Environmental Quality air quality specialist, said local offices got a record number of complaints Wednesday about smoke that blanketed the area. Task force

seeks to aid

Hispanics

BOISE (AP) — Hispanic high school students should be recruited as paid tutors mentors to help Hispanic pre-school children, a task force is suggesting.

The state Board of Education's Task Force on Hispanic Education has come up with tentative suggestions on how to help Hispanics get through the educational system and cut a big dropout rate.

After an organizing session in July and a meeting at Boise State University earlier this month, the task force will meet at University of Idaho on Tuesday. Chairman Sam Byrd said public input is solicited.

"We're particularly interested in people with a background in early childhood development and classroom teaching," said Byrd.

The panel eventually will report to the Board of Education.

Other tentative recommendations:

- That the state provide additional funds to augment inadequate federal support for programs such as Head Start, Migrant Education and Home, Infants and Children.
- That the state should put up more money for "home-school coordinators" working with parents to help students succeed at home.
- Giving teachers adequate resources, training and assistance to make accurate assessments of the abilities and needs of Hispanic students.
- That a person or persons be appointed to oversee the implementation of task force recommendations.

Court says no

to loitering law

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Supreme Court says an anti-loitering law enacted by the city of Pocatello is unconstitutional because it is too vague.

A 3-2 decision upheld Thursday the Supreme Court released lower court rulings against the law. Chief Justice Robert Bakes and Justice Larry Boyle both dissented, saying the Pocatello law would not be imposed in all possible cases and it should not be struck down. Byron Bire was arrested one night in 1987 outside a closed Pocatello convenience store under a city law making it unlawful to loiter or prowl in a place at a time or in a manner not usual for law-abiding individuals.

Based on a 1983 California decision, the Supreme Court held the law unconstitutional because of its vagueness. The law was ruled improper in all instances, not just the Bire case.

PASADENA, Calif.— Besides a preponderance of stars, there is precious little in the yearly Emmy awards to titillate television viewers. Unless the weird or unexpected happens.

On paper, the 42nd Annual Primetime Emmy Awards appear decidedly unexciting. But in the tradition of live television, anything can happen during Sunday night's telecast on the Fox Broadcasting Co. in which "Twin Peaks" and "L.A. Law" were expected to be the big winners.

The Academy of Television Arts and Sciences still winces at past embarrassments.

The 1978 broadcast, which was preempted for more than an hour by a movie premiere announcing the signing of the Camp David accords between Israel and Egypt. The awards ceremony which came to a halt while the historic treaty was unannounced, eventually resumed. Total elapsed time: 4 hours and 10 minutes, the longest Emmy program in history.

The 1980 Screen Actors Guild strike, which left the awards show with no presenters, performers or trophy accepters. Although SAG promised to not picket the ceremony, the union barred 16 members from participating. Some ignored the order. Powers Boothe, who won in the miniseries category that year for his portrayal of President Temple leader Jim Jones, was the only nominee who attended.

TWIN FALLS—Scanning the living room of her Sunburst Street home, Ronda Painter takes stock of "Topsy-turvy" stuffed rabbits, tiny clothes like makes for dolls and for real babies, and cuddly bears of many colors and fabrics.

"Please, will a good fairy come and put snags on these?" she asks, showing a visitor a box crammed full of Barbie-sized doll heads.

Painter is one of about 80 artists and crafters who are expected to be on hand in Twin Falls City Park this weekend for the 4th Annual Twin Falls Arts and Crafts Show.

The event is slated from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. Saturday the show will share the park with the United Way of Magic Valley, which plans a gala kickoff for its fall campaign.

Pam Webb and Donna Frenburg, co-directors for the festival, say they anticipate a lot of variety in this year's offerings. Wooden toys, dried and silk flowers, crocheted goods, stained glass and Austrian crystal jewelry will be among the items on view.

There will also be food. In addition to a big barbecue the United Way plans Saturday; browsers will find hamburgers, Mexican food, pizza, "elephant ears," mini-donuts, corn dogs and popcorn during both days.

Booth fees from the festival will again be donated to United Cerebral Palsy. Webb says the event has raised at least \$1,300 in past years for the foundation.

Like other artists who will be at the show, Painter—who has appeared at the festival each of its four years—has spent the past few weeks readying work to take to the festival. Her living room is stuffed with her creations, yet she says they represent only about an eighth of what she plans to have available this weekend.

Painter, 36, is an energetic woman of many talents. In addition to attending several arts and crafts shows each year, she creates formal attire for weddings, performs alterations and other sewing tasks for up to 100 clients and makes special handmade stuffed animals and gifts.

In the past year, she started making and dressing porcelain dolls. And somehow, she finds time to work part time as a waitress at the Rock Creek.

Although her handmade works are usually found at craft shows, patrons at the gun shows at the Salt Palace in Salt Lake City have also found Painter's products for sale.

Painter explains that she owns Mountainman Gun & Pawn. "When he first started, I'd go and sit there and be bored," she recalls. But when she started making camouflage-stuffed dinosaurs—and later camouflage baby clothes—her business disappeared.

One of her most unusual projects is her line of clothing for babies born prematurely. King World stores carry the tiny togs in the chain's 14 stores, and preemies born at Magic Valley Regional Medical Center wear Painter's clothes during hospital stays.

"Twin Peaks" the television series seemed dark, violent and just plain confusing, don't pick up the musings of its dead-homecoming queen.

This girl imbibed more controlled substances and indulged in more sexual dalliances than the entire cast of a porno movie on location at a crack house.

Released this week by Pocket Books, "The Secret Diary of Laura Palmer" is one of several marketing spinoffs (including a cassette tape, pie and coffee) from the mind-boggling ABC series created by eclectic film maker David Lynch and former "Hill Street-Blue" writer Mark Frost.

It is written, of course, before her murder, which only further unsettles an already unsettling place to live. Peaks — freaks — grab — a pencil. Though the book is billed as containing definitive clues that identify Laura's killer, it's not easy going.

Like the TV series, which ended its first season without disclosing the murderer, the book is a twisted tale of a twisted slice of Americana in which nothing is quite what it seems and sex is never quite making love.

It is vaguely reminiscent of his father's chilling depiction of sexual

blackmail in "Blue Velvet." But Laura Palmer's diary is not cloned from David Lynch.

Yes, says Jennifer Lynch with a smile, smoking cigarettes in her publisher's West Hollywood office, she knows who the killer is.

What about this BOB character in the book and why is every mention of his named spelled in capital letters?

That's the way it needed to be, she answers. Have we seen BOB thus far in "Twin Peaks" episodes?

"I should probably let that slide," she replies. On the subject of herself and on the inner workings of Laura Palmer, the author is, thankfully, less enigmatic.

Jennifer Lynch carries herself with a self-possession that belies her age in conversation she refers to her father as "David" and in a clear, but undeniably, way patiently stresses that she alone is responsible for the book.

"I had a job to do and I did it," she says. "It was a tricky situation at first. I wanted to keep my career different from his."

Humor, war mix in 'Air America'

The following are capsule reviews of movies now showing in the Motion Picture Association of America and the Los Angeles Times. Opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

AIR AMERICA (R) Roger Spottiswoode's high-style black comedy about the covert CIA airlift operation in S.E. Asia during the Vietnam War. It's often intoxicating in its combination of surreal jumpscapes and "MASS" style pranks, but the script finds its focus too late. The film is scaled too big for the tinker-tony ironies you're left with. Mel Gibson and Robert Downey star.

Capsule reviews

ARACHNOPHOBIA (PG-13) For a movie that plans to scare the kapok out of us, Frank Marshall's funny-scary-primal-scream-of-a-comedy is a friendly and nicely witty affair, technically, it's a wonder. It is the classic form, done on a grand scale, the black-Martin style, far from far, away that very nearly wipes out the perfect American small town. On the other hand, we have a very contemporary hero (a dryly humorous Jeff Daniels), un-macho enough to yell to his kids, "We need Mom in here to kill a spider."

DARKMAN (R) It's thinly plotted, predictable, garishly over-violent. But it's the best of all the recent comic-book movies — indeed, the only one that really captures the look, feel and showed-up style of the comic. Director Sam Raimi ("The Evil Dead") and his crew lavish prodigious visual gifts on this movie: a simple, organic tale, with "Count of Monte Cristo" overtones, in which a horribly disfigured scientist (Liam Neeson), who can change his face at will, seeks revenge on the criminal vermin (including surreally vicious Larry Drake) who destroyed his life.

FLATLINERS (R) Some lines shouldn't be crossed; some movies shouldn't be watched. No, that's not easy. This Joel Schumacher film, in which five photogenic med students decide to experience death and afterlife scientifically, is eminently watchable, gloriously aflame with swanky deep-focus decor. But it's built around the kind of spiritually huckster tale Maseratis with. The theme is like a little dry pea rattling through the vast, echoing-museum of the high-tech images: Why should anyone risk death to see the afterlife depicted here, when they can get the same stuff by subscribing to cable TV?

GHOST (PG-13) The movie's slogan is "Believe, not an unreasonable request." But even those who'd be happy to comply must get past a certain woolly-mindedness to its script and a production prettified to the point of stickiness. With some of its actors — Demi Moore as the cracked-voiced, desolate lover; Whoopi Goldberg as an extremely reluctant spirit; go-between and Vincent Schiavelli as an insouciant, sub-way-dwelling ghost — things are in the best hands possible. But Patrick Swayze as a corporate New York banker? Never in a 7-million-corporate years.

In 'Postcards,' Hollywood takes a hard look at itself

HOLLYWOOD Postcards From The Edge: If We should be so lucky. You can write something on a postcard. This is more like fortune cookies, pithy, expert zingers from the mother-daughter battle-field. Hollywood division: a star of '50s musicals (Shirley MacLaine) and her movie actress-daughter (Meryl Streep) struggling with a drug habit that lifelong insecurity has built.

Review

As Carrie Fisher has adapted her successful, somewhat autobiographical 1987 novel about the physical and psychological rehabilitation of a spirited, wisecracking, just-turning-30 actress, she has taken one of the book's most minor preoccupations, the mother-daughter stuff, and made it the movie's whole shooting match.

"Postcards" is a puzzle. It's possible to float out of it on the titanic high generated by Streep's two-trial numbers, singing as affecting as Bonnie Raitt. If it needed proving, it's clear now that there is nothing Streep cannot do, except, possibly, oral surgery, and high-platform diving, and only a sucker would bet against either of those.

As director Mike Nichols speeds the movie by and Streep's Suzanne Vale gives behind-the-scenes Hollywood the benefit of her wry eye and bad mouth, it's a funny-void to be let in on — hip, inside and deadly clever. Unsurprisingly, with this director and this writer, "Postcards" cuts close to the bone with its insights about the workings of old and new Hollywood — a past full of stars with ironclad images built by studios and nourished by fan magazines, and an unsentimental and utterly forget-

ful present in which grosses alone are the measure of success. But apart from Suzanne and her egocentric mama, MacLaine's Doris Mann, who can suck minutes, these enemies get what they want from the sheer warmth and presence of their actors, a considerable amount in the case of Hackman and Dreyfuss. Quaid, playing a character so loosely sketched that it isn't clear

whether he's a producer or Suzanne's fellow actor, still seems to be flitting away like Jerry Lee Lewis, although that song has ended.

"As we first meet Suzanne," she's twirling, blurring and snorting her way through a crummy-looking movie about Latin American intrigue, directed by Hackman. Next, she awakens in the other half of Central, and finds herself in a detox center, headed by a no-nonsense therapist played by C.C. Hyde. Pounder — her power reduced to slivers of scenes, improbably brief as the detox-section is. Streep gets memorable support from Robin Bartlett as her rehab roomie Aretha (of "I Wanna Be Like You" fame), whose parents were expecting someone black, whose dry delivery and owlish take on life are the stuff of which lifelong friendships are made.

These and wickedly funny backstage snap shots of movie making are the good times of "Postcards," but even they can't hide its emotional starvation. While we chorize at the one-liners — and Streep's running, grumbling delivery of them — the real work seems to happen too fast and offscreen. Drug rehabilitation, family reconciliation, career regression, work, casually matched though Streep and MacLaine seem as a mother and daughter, they bring every drop of empathy from a last-minute hospital-bed scene of caring and contrition. Nevertheless, "Postcards" is a quick-sketch of a screenplay whose details are still to come.

Even if it comes straight out of left field, Streep's performance as a country singer at the movie's close is irresistible. Just let your mind loose at this point; this is such un-abashed fun that there's not much left to do but roll with it, in the same way you can luxuriate in Michael Ballhaus' fluid camera work, Patricia Von Braunhau's designs, for the peculiarly awful movies Suzanne is making, Ann Roth's witty perfect costumes; and J. Roy Helland's superb hair and makeup, which in MacLaine's case is a devastating trip down Memory Lane.

Florida State reported ready to join Atlantic Conference







"It has to become a lifestyle," he said. "People nowadays want things too fast. If they could make bodybuilding harder, I think I'd like it even more."

Peymann will appear in four national weightlifting magazines within the next two months. He is frequently asked why he lives in Idaho, which is far from most major bodybuilding shows.

The answer, according to Peymann, is simple: 80 percent of bodybuilding is nutrition and where better than Idaho to find wholesome foods.

His diet spans the Magic Valley, with spring water from Sun Valley,

organic grain from the Camas Prairie, fish from the Thousand Springs Trout Farm in Hagerman, eggs from the Parkfair Poultry Farm in Richfield and potatoes from Bully.

In addition, Peymann has a large garden and raises his own poultry. He spends at least two hours each day studying nutrition.

A typical day starts out at 5:30 a.m. with a breakfast of fried egg whites (15), a cup of oatmeal, one half-cup of low-fat yogurt and a banana. Peymann eats seven meals every day, one every two hours.

A native of Phoenix, Ariz., Peymann first moved to Idaho in 1972. He describes himself as "a home-town boy" who likes the relaxed atmosphere of Southern Idaho.

He is a five-time Idaho powerlifting champion and still holds Idaho state records in several events. Peymann hopes to win the Mr. America title by age 40. Staying away from steroids and maintaining his strict dietary regimen are essential to longevity in the sport, he said.

"Very few people I competed against when I started out are still around," he said. "I'm confident I can go on for another 10 years."

THE ACES ON BRIDGE BOBBY WOLFE

Whipping and abuse are like laudanum; you have to double the dose as the sensibilities dull.

—Harriet Beecher Stowe

When an audacious opponent makes an two-level overcall in a 3-level suit, it's usually a good idea to double for punishment. Today's example from the Phoenix Regional Tournament demonstrates the best way to exact the maximum penalty.

It's tough for a vulnerable East to sit for the penalty double, however. East deferred to West in hopes of maintaining marital harmony.

What's West's best lead? If he leads spades to reduce South's trump holding, he plays right into dummy's squeeze. East takes and two ruffs with his small trumps and then escapes with either two or three down — a filthy score for East-West.

The maximum penalty is achieved if West leads trumps. His aim is to eventually draw South's small trumps so that South cannot score any ruffing tricks.

The trump king (in case dummy has a singleton honor) is led, and South wins the ace. A club is led to dummy's queen and East takes and discards a club and then ruffs out South's heart queen. East continues with the king queen — a second trump is led to South's jack, and South tries a spade exit. West wins his jack and leads a third high discard to remove South's honor.

South exits in clubs and the defenders are in charge. East wins and leads a third club for West to ruff, and West picks up trumps. The rest of the tricks belong to the defense, and South is held to only his three high trumps — a very nice (scoring).





James Earl Jones plays convicted killer released after spending 20 years in jail

James Earl Jones has been something of a ubiquitous commodity lately. Active in feature films ("The Hunt for Red October"), cable movies ("Heat Wave") and network TV movies ("Last Flight Out"), Jones now is turning his talents to a prime-time drama called "Gabriel's Fire."

The series, which airs Thursdays on ABC, stars Jones as Gabriel Bird, a convicted killer who has spent 20 years in prison and suddenly, unwillingly finds himself back on the streets, released on a legal technicality. "Oh God, why?" wonders Bird on the eve of his release. "For years I prayed, I begged for freedom, and you were silent. Now that there's nothing left, you give me what I wanted — freedom. Freedom to do what? To wander the streets alone? Gabriel Bird is dead; I'm convict D72721." But Gabriel Bird is not dead; he only awaits resuscitation.

Laura Robins plays Victoria Heller, the attorney who learns about Bird while investigating the circumstances surrounding the death of one of her clients in prison. She takes it upon herself to get him released. ("He's gonna get justice whether he likes it or not," Heller says to an assistant after Bird refuses to meet with her in jail.) Subsequently, Heller also employs Bird as a private investigator on a case-by-case basis.

To be sure, there were extenuating circumstances that led Bird, the only black cop on a Chicago special operations unit, to gun down a fel-

low police officer during a 1969 raid on a suspected safe-house of the militant Black Liberation Movement. But Bird is guilty of pulling the trigger, a fact that he confirms in an angry confrontation with Heller in the series pilot: "I am not innocent. You just sprang a murderer, I wasn't framed; I'm guilty."

According to co-executive producer Coleman Luck ("The Equalizer"), Gabriel Bird is the kind of tainted hero that it is important for television to present. "Establishing Bird's guilt was very important to us," says Luck in a telephone interview. "The difference between him and the other prisoners is that he really understands his part in the guilt ... and he accepts it. That's a very important part of his character, and this is important for television to do. Everybody is tired of the perfect hero. It's not realistic,

and it's not interesting."

"Gabriel's Fire" was written with Jones in mind. "When I came over to Lorimar, they asked me if I would be interested in working on a project with James Earl Jones," says Luck. "I jumped at the opportunity. Jones had already approved the basic concept, so we (Luck and co-executive producer Robert Lieberman) came in and made it into a story and a script and so forth." The series is airing on a network that has built its recent success on sometimes unusual programming choices (e.g., "America's Funniest Home Videos," "Twin Peaks" and "Life Goes On").

Soap opera scene

Fontaine could be the boost soap needs

General Hospital—Hoot along in the number two ratings slot just behind "The Young and the Restless." A small boost is required for the show to be king of the mountain again in the afternoon.

The answer just might be "General Hospital's" new Hispanic storyline, a long overdue attempt to tap the huge Hispanic audience. Step number one was the appearance of beautiful Laura Herring, the first Hispanic Miss USA of 1985. As Carla, love interest for Colton, Laura must learn the acting business on camera so boss Joe Hardy signed New York's Robert Fontaine to play Frankie Greco alongside Carla.

Watching handsome, skillful Fontaine in action, it appears the soap may have stumbled onto a new Hispanic matinee idol. Fontaine could be "General Hospital's" main attraction this fall.

The trick is to write Fontaine's Frankie, bring out his emotions, avoid the path of villains. At first, the soap's writers weren't sure which way to play Frankie. The actor had to provide the clues. Schooled in the New York theater, Fontaine holds the eye with his presence. He's a sensitive Frankie, so different from the usual Hollywood macho Latin image.

Fontaine knows this is the place to be, yet his heart belongs to the theater and his native Bay Bridge neighborhood in Brooklyn. Since the age of 14, Robert has been smitten with the theater. His heroes are Chekhov, Strindberg, Pinter and his favorite—O'Neill. When he describes the hunt for strict acting coaches and how to "smell them out," Fontaine can be most ingratiating.

He's a Brooklyn kid without an accent, in love with his work, used to six- and eight-month layoffs between theater jobs, but determined to hold on.

As for opinions of L.A., a lonely town, and the soap business, Fontaine keeps it to himself, allowing surprise over local casting requirements where beauty often takes precedence over training.

At the moment, Fontaine is showing Mom the sights; exposing her to crazy, exhibitionist Venice, Calif.

It's so different from the Fontaine neighborhood in Brooklyn where the actor intends to live out his days.

"It's peaceful, serene, nothing has changed in 40 years," says Robert. "In my neighborhood, you don't leave. You stay and you raise your family. We're very tight-knit and secure, and I love it."

Does that sound like a new Hispanic hero? It shows a bit of the actor's emotional core. With a little care and help from the staff writing staff, Robert Fontaine could be a ground-breaker. Tune in - you won't be disappointed.

Most soap opera actors don't know what their character will be doing a few weeks hence. However, Gillian Spencer, who writes for ABC's "All My Children" and recently returned to Pine Valley, resurrecting her character, Daisy Cortlandt, is the exception. Gillian

Miss America pageant takes the crown as last week's most watched TV show

LOS ANGELES (AP) — TV coverage of a superpower huddle to discuss the Middle East crisis and a late-summer premiere proved no competition for the Miss America pageant, which was the most watched show on television last week.

Saturday night's crowning of Marjorie, Judith Vincent from Illinois breezed past a CBS update on the Helsinki superpower summit and NBC's debut of "The Fanelli Boys," situation comedy, according to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

NBC's live broadcast of the Miss America pageant grabbed a 17.8 average rating, well ahead of the network's "The Golden Girls," which occupied the No. 2 spot with a 15.9 average. Both ratings point represents 931,000 homes.

In the No. 6 slot was Sunday's "60 Minutes," featuring a segment by Dan Rather in Helsinki, where President Bush and Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev discussed the Iraq invasion of Kuwait.

Landing in the No. 4 spot was NBC's Saturday night premiere of "The Fanelli Boys," a half-hour program focusing on four Italian

brothers in Brooklyn and their widowed mother.



Wallace will stay until 'toes turn up'

NEW YORK (AP) — Mike Wallace, 72, the senior citizen of CBS News' durable "60 Minutes," said Tuesday he'll retire only when he dies — or, as he put it, his "toes turn up."

Wallace, who with Harry Reasoner was on the staff of "60 Minutes" when it began 23 years ago this month, spoke at a breakfast to publicize "Mike Wallace, Then and Now," a CBS News Special. The one-hour program, scheduled for Sept. 26, is a retrospective of

his 40-year career in news, of which 31 years have been at CBS.

The program includes old black-and-white clips of his smoke-wreathed "Night Beat" one-on-one series of the mid-1950s. The show, which began on local TV in New York and then appeared on ABC, was responsible for first gaining Wallace fame as a hard-boiled interviewer who rarely gave his subjects any slack.

As a result of one interview on that show, Wallace said, he was

sued for libel. Then Los Angeles Police Chief William Parker sued over remarks about him by mobster Mickey Cohen. Wallace said ABC settled the suit for \$44,000.

The most publicized lawsuit against him was by retired Gen. William C. Westmoreland, who sought \$120 million for a 1982 "CBS Reports" documentary, "The Uncounted Enemy: A Vietnam Deception." Westmoreland dropped the libel lawsuit in February 1985 after a long trial.
