Gem graduation prayers ACLU target

TWIN FALLS, Idaho—The American Civil Liberties Union wants a ban on prayer at public school graduation ceremonies in Idaho.
Alan Koford, Idaho president of the ACLU and Jack Van Valkenburg, the ACLU's new full-time state director, said Thursday that objections to the practice have been filed by Christian and non-Chris-

tian students alike at the University of Idaho, but that President Elisabeth Zinsler has said there is nothing she can do to halt the tradition.
"We're doing everything we can to encourage them to comply with the law, including possibly taking the school to court if it attempts to win voluntary acquiescence," Koford said.
Federal courts have ruled that conducting prayer at public school activities is unconstitutional.

"We prefer prevention over litigation," he said, "though sometimes it cannot be avoided."
The next step, he said, will be to pressure the State Board of Education, which also oversees operations of the university, to eliminate the practice.
"It's high time the university discontinue it's unconstitutional practices," Van Valkenburg added.
"The university had no immediate comment. But Attorney General Jim Jones said

he believed the illegality of prayer in public institutions is not clear-cut, and he speculated that the current U.S. Supreme Court might well permit prayer if the issue was presented to it.
"In my own mind, I don't think it's an open-and-shut question," Jones said. "I think there's a gray area in graduation prayer."
The College of Southern Idaho has opening and closing prayers in its commencement.

Robbins may spend \$100,000 in quest to win 8-county District 25 Senate seat

TWIN FALLS—The state Senate member from Twin Falls, Rob Robbins, said Tuesday that he is already in Idaho and he'll be in one of the most pricey.
Campaign finance reports aren't due in the secretary of state's office until Oct. 30, but Robbins said Thursday he's prepared to spend \$100,000 to win the District 25 state Senate seat representing eight Magic Valley counties.
"I've been in enough campaigns to know you do it two ways: either you knock-on doors or it's bought," Robbins said Thursday. "Although he'd prefer knocking on doors, Robbins, a Democrat, fears his Republican

opponent will rely on a heavy-duty media budget because Newcomb is too busy with his medical practice to campaign in person."
Newcomb was first in air television commercials. He has also purchased space in area news papers.
"We just kind of guessimate that he's going to spend \$70,000 to \$80,000," Robbins said.
Relying on Gov. Cecil Andrus and 2nd District Congressman Richard Stratton as "big-name" drivers, Robbins has already raised more than \$56,000 through direct

mail and fund-raising receptions. He has hired Sally Tröst, a Republican with a successful track record as a Washington, D.C., fund-raising consultant, to help him land the \$100,000 cushion Robbins thinks he'll need.
But Newcomb insists he has plenty of time to campaign in person. He said he'll refuse to turn this into a six-figure race.
"I think that number is obscene at a time when what is \$2.30 a bushel," Newcomb said.
So far, Newcomb estimates that he has raised about \$18,000. He said he'd be surprised if he spends more than \$30,000 in total.

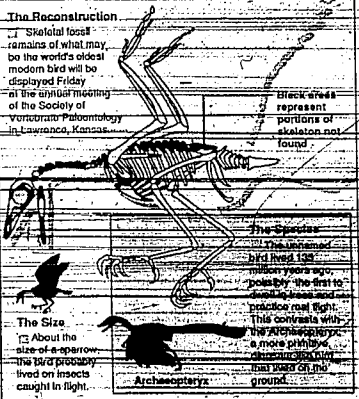
U.S. halts flights for safety review

Britain's foreign secretary said Thursday that Saddam Hussein must be told force will be used if Iraq doesn't withdraw from Kuwait.
The Air Force meanwhile, grounded 24 hours from midday Wednesday until midday Thursday to discuss safety with pilots. The entire fleetwide separate accidents this week in which 12 U.S. servicemen died.
A group of 321 U.S. evacuees from Iraq and Kuwait landed in Britain on Thursday in the first such flight in nearly three weeks. Most of the passengers were Americans and many were children.
The Americans and Canadians on the flight were to leave Friday for Raleigh-Durham International Airport in North Carolina, said Andrew Varney, Garwick airport's director of public affairs.
In Washington, state Department spokeswoman Margaret Tutwiler described as "simply outrageous" Iraq's treatment of the 270 Americans and foreign-born family members aboard the flight.

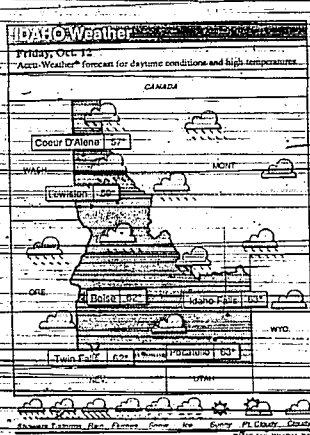
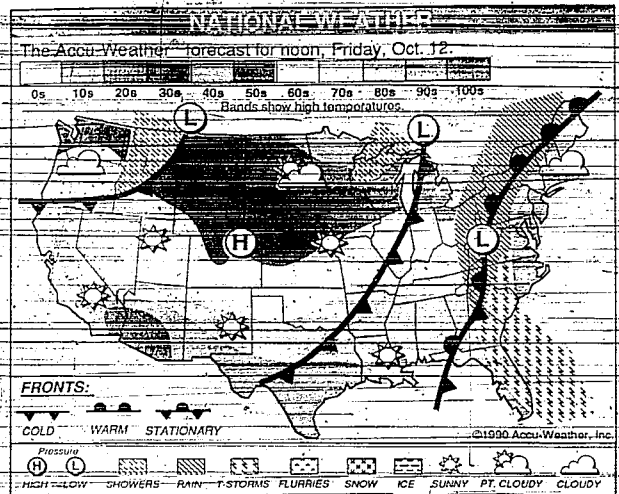
135 million years ago, this bird flew

A 135 million-year-old fossil found in 1987 in China has turned out to be the skeleton of the oldest bird ever found that lived in trees and flew like modern birds.
Paleontologist Paul Sereno of the University of Chicago said that the specimen, called *Archaeopteryx lithuanica*, dinosaur-like features and probably represents a transitional period during which birds were evolving into the kinds of creatures we see today. The recent discovery is 10 million years younger than the oldest bird fossil, and that beast was quite different.
The older *Archaeopteryx* lived on the ground, and could probably climb trees, but could not fly. It bore little similarity to modern birds.
The newly discovered skeleton is fairly complete because it was preserved in the fine sediment of an ancient lake bed that hardened into rock. A lack of water current and oxygen reduced decay and kept the bones undisturbed, although the skull bones apparently floated apart, before fossilizing, making the reconstruction slightly more difficult.
The discovery will be presented Friday at the annual meeting of the Society of Vertebrate Paleontology in Lawrence, Kan.
Sereno said the reconstructed bird shows the earliest birds were skittered at home in trees.

Tropical storm triggers heavy rains across Southeast

Tropical depression, with storm warnings being cancelled, Hurricane Lili posed a potential threat to coastal areas south of the Georgia coast on 7 inches of rain Wednesday and Thursday, including 7.70 inches at Hinesville, 7.70 inches at Jessup and 6.66 inches at Statesboro, the National Weather Service said.

Showers developed behind a cold front crossing the north-central states and were widely scattered from Minnesota to the Carolinas, Georgia, South Carolina and reported in southeastern Wyoming.

A heavy rain squall line moved into the 60s and 70s in the southern Plains after recording morning lows in the upper 30s and 40s.

Thursday's low for the Lower 48 states was 18 at Gunnison, Colo., and Baker, Ore.

Jews celebrate at Wailing Wall

JERUSALEM (AP) — Thousands of Jews, many carrying guns, danced at the Western Wall to end the Sukkot festival Thursday, and the adjacent Temple Mount on Monday at least 19 Palestinians were killed and 140 wounded when police fired at rioters stoning Jewish worshippers at the site.

The large crowd gathered here today shows that nothing in the world can break us, Parliament Speaker Dov Shilansky told about 35,000 people squeezed into the cobblestone plaza in front of the wall, the most community town in the West as the Wailing Wall.

Ultra-orthodox Jews carrying sacred Torah scrolls stood side by side with less observant courtiers waving Israeli flags.

Thousands of riot police backed the soldiers, were deployed at the Wall and the adjacent Temple Mount on Monday at least 19 Palestinians were killed and 140 wounded when police fired at rioters stoning Jewish worshippers at the site.

Many Palestinians living in the nearby Moslem Quarter stayed in doors as policemen escorted singing and dancing Jews through the narrow alleys in the Wall. Police pushed the gates of the Old City, fuming Palestinians, and many were turned away.

«We will prevent young inciters from reaching the area,» said Jerusalem's police commander.

Many worshippers carried submachine guns slung over their shoulders or had pistols tucked into their belts.

«Thousands of people came in and saw to those who stoned us,» they said. «We are glad that Jerusalem is indivisible,» said a spokesman for the Jewish Affairs Ministry.

Avner Shuki told the crowd.

In New York City, meanwhile, the U.N. Security Council held consultations to end the anti-Jewish violence in Jerusalem but a vote was not expected Thursday.

Some evanescent said they were threatened with weapons in the board the flight, she said.

While Westerners continued to flee occupied Kuwait with tales of low food supplies and looting by Iraqi troops, international pressure grew against Saddam to withdraw from the oil-rich emirate he invaded and annexed.

Speaking at the annual conference of the governing Conservative Party in Bournemouth, England, British Foreign Secretary Douglas Hurd urged the world to remain united against Iraq's aggression.

«It is difficult to hold,» then despite the coalition, despite the leadership of the United States, despite the cooperation of the Soviet Union — then we shall be back in a world of anarchy punctuated by explosions of force,» Hurd said.

«The clouds would have extinguished the light. We cannot allow this to happen.»

Hurd also said Saddam should know that force will be used if Iraq does not pull out of Kuwait, which his troops invaded on Aug. 2.

«They will be in the minds of the Iraqis the certainty that they have to leave Kuwait. It is not peacefully, then forced out by military action,» Hurd said.

Oil prices rose \$2.23 a barrel in New York Thursday to close at \$40.43 on unfounded rumors that a Palestine terrorist group lobbied West Bank land taken from the Arabs in the 1967 war. Stocks in New York again fell, down 42.92 points.

«If it's going to spend that, he's going to have to go off the air pretty soon,» Robbins countered.

Although \$100,000 is nearly four times what Robbins spent to win this year's seat in 1984, other Idaho legislators have topped \$100,000 in recent years.

According to the Idaho secretary of state's office, the most expensive race so far was the battle between Democrat Michael Burket and incumbent Senate Republican Pro Tem Jim Risch in 1988.

Risch spent \$112,310 between January 1987 and December 1988.

Robbins spent \$139,214.09 in the same time period to win the District 91 state Senate seat representing Ada County.

Idaho state legislators are paid \$6,000 annually — although they may receive pay raises to more than \$12,000 next year.

Since candidates seldom finance their own campaigns, most rely on contributions from individuals, corporations and political action committees formed by special interest groups.

Robbins and Newcomb have collected money from a variety of sources, including PACs.

Newcomb said he has also received some help from the Senate GOP caucus, but no contributions yet from the Idaho Republican Party.

Robbins described the Idaho Democratic Party as a «major contributor» in his campaign.

His campaign held a 23-19 majority in the state Senate and a ROBBINS victory could help tip the scales in favor of the Democrats.

«It's considered by a lot of people a race that's important to win in Magic Valley for a variety of reasons,» Robbins said.

The ACLU is involved in a dispute with officials of the Madison School District in Bergburg over religious instruction in public schools, and legal action was being contemplated.

President plans visits to Latin America

WASHINGTON — President Bush will make state visits to Mexico next month and to five South American countries in December, the White House announced Thursday.

Bush will visit Monterrey, Mexico, on Nov. 26, and at the invitation of Mexican President Carlos Salinas de Gortari, White House spokesman Martin Fitzwater said.

Bush will also travel to Brazil, Uruguay, Argentina, Chile and Venezuela on Dec. 2-8 on his second trip to South America as president.

The president will also meet in Honolulu on Oct. 27 with leaders of 13 Pacific Island states of Micronesia, Melanesia and Polynesia. The meeting in Hawaii with the Pacific island leaders will take place during a five-day political campaign swing that will also take Bush to New Mexico, Arizona, California and Oklahoma.

Tape recording reveals hunter's horror

BANGOR, Maine — The first testimony at a hunter's manslaughter trial Thursday was a tape recording of his horror at shooting a woman he said he thought was a deer.

"When I got there, she was laying on the ground and I lost it right there," Donald Rogerson told a game warden, who recorded their conversation about one hour after the blood was killed Nov. 15, 1988.

"All I could think of was 'I just don't want her to die,'" Rogerson said on the tape, his voice trembling.

Safety official refuses Jeep investigation

WASHINGTON — The government's top highway safety official refused Thursday to order a recall investigation of Jeep CJ vehicles. A consumer group said the decision was a "death sentence" for many Americans.

"An extensive inquiry turned up no evidence that design flaws make the Jeep CJ vehicles unsafe," said Joseph R. Curry, administrator of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The agency also found no evidence that the vehicles' manufacturer, American Motors Corp., withheld information of the problem in 1987. Chrysler Corp. acquired AMC in 1987.

Report warns of future shuttle risks

WASHINGTON — A congressional report warns that shuttle flights and other space activities could be hampered by debris in the next 20-30 years if nations continue to litter the most traveled paths.

Already, the Hubble Space Telescope, which has enough problems of its own because of faulty optics, has been given a one-in-100 chance of being severely damaged by space debris during its 17-year lifetime, said the Office of Technology Assessment.

"Even small debris particles can produce high levels of damage," said Ray Williamson, who directed the study. "The average collision velocity in low earth orbit is about 10 kilometers (6.2 miles) a second."

At such speed, an object having one-thirty-fifth the weight of an aspirin tablet would have the impact of a 30-06 bullet, he said.

Air Force secretary goes to bat for B-2

WASHINGTON — Air Force Secretary Donald Rice pleaded with Congress on Thursday not to decide the fate of the troubled B-2 bomber based on a Pentagon review that found widespread problems with the aircraft's manufacturer.

"It would be both inappropriate and unwise to use the review," Rice told the Senate Armed Services Committee at a hastily-scheduled hearing.

Weapon systems must continue to be judged on the basis of performance, he said.

Seeking to repair the damage to the B-2 bomber program from Air Force testimony earlier this week on major problems at the Northrop Corp., Sen. Sam Nunn, D-Ga., summoned Rice before the panel to discuss the service's review.

Brando plea bargain efforts break down

SANTA MONICA, Calif. — Efforts to negotiate a plea bargain on the murder charge against Marlon Brando's son have broken down, lawyers said Thursday, and a judge scheduled the trial to begin Nov. 5.

"Nobody's talking settlement now," Deputy District Attorney William Clark told reporters after a brief hearing.

Clark said there were talks last week between Christian Brando's lawyer and prosecutors about a possible plea bargain after it became apparent Brando's sister, Chyenne, was unlikely to testify.

Sun Belt area expected to lead U.S. growth

WASHINGTON (AP) — Seven Sun Belt metropolitan areas will experience the fastest economic growth of all U.S. cities between now and the end of the century, the government predicted Thursday.

The fastest-growing cities generally will be in the Midwest, the Commerce Department said in a report issued every five years.

Among 54 metropolitan areas expected to have populations of one million or more by the year 2000, the seven with the fastest growth will be West Palm Beach, Fla.; Phoenix, Ariz.; Orlando, Fla.; Riverside, Calif.; San Diego, Sacramento, Calif.; and Tampa, Fla.

"The fastest growing areas will all benefit from strong migration flows. This has been a part of economic development for the past 25 years and the Commerce Department expects that to continue," said economist Mark Zandi of Regional Financial Associates in West Chester, Pa.

Each of the seven areas has a high number of jobs, a high percentage of the population under 18, and a high percentage of the population aged 18 and over, he said. "Also, housing affordability, except for Riverside and San Diego, are still pretty good."

Other areas projected to have above-average growth are Anaheim, Calif.; Fort Lauderdale, Fla.; Atlanta, Ga.; Jacksonville, Fla.; and Oakland, Calif., the department said.

The six areas with the slowest projected growth are New Orleans; New York; Rochester, N.Y.; Pittsburgh; Cleveland; and Detroit. Large cities expected to grow at a below-average rate are Louisville, Ky.; St. Louis; and Bergen N.J.

Zandi said the slower-growing areas in general have either a higher than-average dependence on manufacturing or on a single industry.

Even though output may be growing in many of them, improved productivity will keep growth in the number of jobs down, he said.

New York's economy should remain fairly good, Zandi said, but its growth ranking is low because there is little room left to expand.

The Commerce Department made projections in four areas — total personal income, population, employment and per capita income. It ranked the first three to pick the fastest growing cities.

West Palm Beach was first in all three with 48.4 percent total income growth predicted between 1988 and

2000, a 24.8 percent population growth and 30.4 percent job growth.

Phoenix was second in income growth and third in both job and population growth.

New Orleans was the only city predicted to have a population decline, -0.1 percent, and it had the worst job growth, -6.1 percent.

Rochester showed the smallest predicted income growth, 14.1 percent. New York ranked next-to-last in all three areas.

Cities with the fastest growth predicted in income per person in general ranked low in 1988. Those with the slowest expected growth for the most part ranked highest in 1988.

However, San Francisco, with a \$26,309 per capita income, was expected to grow a better-than-average 16.2 percent to \$30,582 and keep its growth predicted between 1988 and No. 1 ranking.

School revises pledge to include unborn

LORAIN, Ohio (AP) — A Roman Catholic school revised the Pledge of Allegiance to say "with liberty and justice for the born and unborn," angering some students who said the issue has no place in a public school.

The school changed the Constitution, Angela Martinez, a Lorain Catholic High School junior, said Thursday.

Robert Garcia, a senior, also said the change, which began this week, was a bad idea.

"I feel the 'born and unborn' shouldn't be added to the pledge as a pledge to our country."

"The pledge deals with patriotism," he said.

This week has been designated by U.S. Catholic schools as "respect for life" week, said Robert Kealey, executive director for the Washington, D.C.-based National Catholic Education Association. Students are being urged to reflect on the issue of abortion, euthanasia, the home-

less and poverty.

Americans met most objectives to lower blood pressure

ATLANTA (AP) — Americans achieved most of the objectives aimed at lowering their blood pressures during the past decade, with one important exception: losing weight, the national Centers for Disease Control said Thursday.

Seven of the nine U.S. health objectives relating to blood pressure, however, have been met, including a reduction in the rate of high blood pressure nationwide, the CDC said.

In 1970, when the federal Department of Health and Human Services prepared its 1990 health goals for the nation, hypertension — high blood pressure — was defined as a reading of 160/95 or higher.

By this year, the government hoped to have at least 60 percent of Americans who met that definition to control their blood pressures with medication, diet and exercise. One recent survey indicated a level of 65 percent, the CDC said.

However, the goal of reducing the overweight population to 10 percent of the total population and less than 17 percent of adult women was not reached, the CDC said.

According to a 1988 federal survey, 27 percent of adult men and 26 percent of adult women were more than 20 percent above their recommended weight, it said.

Being overweight increases the risk of high blood pressure, which, in turn, is a cause of heart disease and strokes.

Improvements in blood pressure control have contributed to a 30 percent decrease in stroke and a 35 percent decrease in coronary heart disease since 1972, the Atlanta-based CDC said, citing a 1988 federal report.

"Despite this progress, 30 million persons in the United States still have inadequately controlled blood pressure."

Although comprehensive studies are not complete, the goal of having at least 60 percent of the hypertensive population in control of their blood pressure "has most likely been met," the CDC said, citing various studies over the past several years.

Ulysses probe fires thrusters

EDWARDS AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. (AP) — Ulysses started firing its thrusters Thursday to begin its main antenna toward Earth, and the shuttle that launched the probe was in fine shape after a 1.7-million-mile flight, NASA said.

The space agency meanwhile formed a team to investigate why the thrusters began firing on Monday with incorrect instructions for how it should operate some of its computer programs, said shuttle project engineer Chris Fairley.

Discovery landed early Wednesday after sending Ulysses on a 16-year, 1.86-billion-mile journey to study the sun's poles.

Shuttle processing manager Tip Talone said only 10 to 15 of Discovery's heat-shield tiles need to be replaced. Debris that hit the shuttle during its launch and landing caused 13 "dings" — finger-thick, one-inch, and about 50 smaller ones.

"That's a very low number," Talone said. "Every time we come back, we seem to learn more about how to fly and land the thing without taking a lot of hits."

Ulysses' maneuvering, which will end Friday, was designed to let the spacecraft communicate with controllers more quickly by using its high-gain antenna, a 5.4-foot-wide dish, said Franklin O'Donnell, a spokesman for NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory.

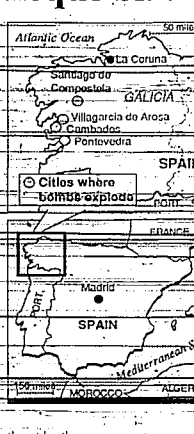

Fund-raising group agrees to stop promotion

A nationwide Republican campaign funding organization has agreed to withdraw its effort to raise money in Idaho by offering people a \$25 check, Attorney General Jim Jones said Thursday.

The Republican Presidential Task Force has agreed to contact the people who signed up to donate \$25 per month indefinitely by creating a \$25 check, and offer them refunds, Jones said. Earlier in the day, Idaho Democratic Chairman Conley Ward asked Jones to investigate whether the fund-raising tactic violates state consumer protection laws or criminal fraud statutes.

But Jones said on Sept. 28, he contacted the organization requesting information on what they were doing, and officials agreed to stop it, although there was no admission that there was anything wrong.

"We issued an investigative demand to the Republican Presidential Task Force, the national Republican Senatorial Committee and Albert E. Mitchell, who signed the letter as executive director of the Republican Presidential Task Force," said Jones.

Jones said the group informed him they sent 7,000 letters to Idaho residents. The same letter went out nationwide, raising progress from Democrats in some states.

Letters told the recipients they could cash the \$25 checks at "ABSOLUTELY NO COST TO YOU."

He also called upon Republican U.S. Senate candidate Rep. Larry Craig to return the more than \$54,000 he has received from the Republican Senatorial Committee.

"Larry Craig is one of the committee's largest beneficiaries," said Ward, "and he has continued to take their money after this fraud became public knowledge."

Jones said the GOP group acknowledged it got 36 Idaho residents to sign up. Another 23 somehow cashed the \$25 check without committing themselves to the donations, he said.

"We have reached tentative agreement with them whereby they stopped using the solicitation," said Jones. "They will contact everyone in

This week's Times-News series on migrants in the Magic Valley reports that the valley's 11,000 "guest workers" endure third-world conditions. They live in substandard housing, do without health care and make only sporadic connections with the education system.

Substitute workers are inherently less efficient than employees who have a stake in their work. A family whose members toil from dusk to dawn from grammar school to grave, afraid to go to the doctor or send its kids to school, is not going to be willing to make an investment in the economic future of its employer.

But the series pointed out something more disturbing. For most of us—that 8 percent of the valley's population is all but invisible. Separated by language and isolated by culture, the Magic Valley's migrants lack access to virtually every institution in our society.

Moreover, the 1986 Immigration Reform and Control Act makes it increasingly unlikely that the Magic Valley will be able to export the social costs of migrants much longer.

That law allowed others—who could prove they had been working in the United States—to apply for citizenship, and hundreds of thousands have done so. Idaho's migrant population has gone from mostly male to mostly families, and many are staying in the Magic Valley.

The higher social costs and increased crime rates are going to be hard to ignore. Making sure that all Magic Valley residents have access to housing, health care, education and justice will be cheaper in the long run.

On a more fundamental level, there are parallel Magic Valleys—one comfortable and one destitute—and all of us are poorer for it.

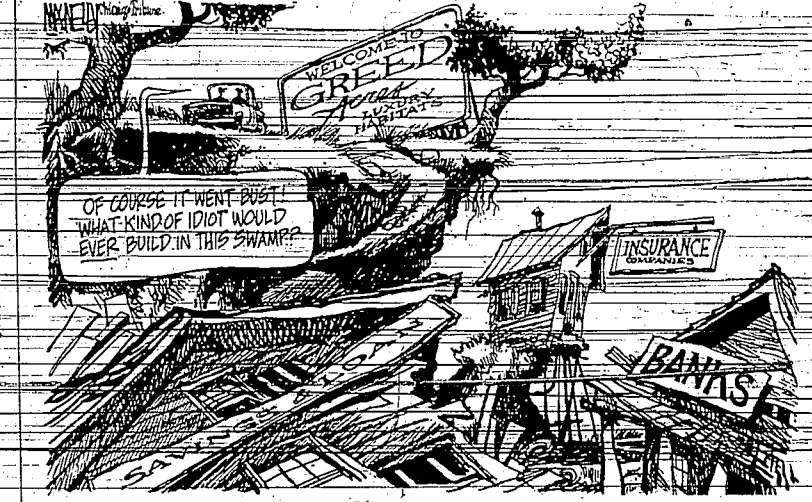

Permit lack snags new kindergarten

JEROME — Construction of the school district's new kindergarten at the end of East 10th Street may have to stop because the district hasn't obtained a building permit for the project.

But before a permit can be issued, a street must be paved, gutters must be installed and fire hydrants and a sewer line are required, according to Kirk Hansen, county building inspector.

"I can't issue a building permit as long as the construction is in violation of the city requirements," Hansen said.

The 4,752-square-foot, four-classroom building is being built on school owned property that is outside city limits but within the city's permit zone, and therefore under city regulations.

The City Council voted to rezone the property from agriculture to R-2 residential, which classifies the development project as a subdivision.

Construction of the building, property owners are responsible for putting in streets, gutters and sewer lines, Larry Johns, city building inspector said.

The foundation for the building has been poured and footings have been completed, but the building can go no further, according to Hansen.

Workers are still waiting for the concrete to settle before continuing work.

Gooding teachers upset at district's fund balance

GOODING — Local educators buy their own school supplies, work second jobs and pay for their own living expenses while receiving below average starting pay from a district that has an unreasonably large fund balance, according to a teacher's association survey.

But the district officials maintain that it is not unusual for teachers to buy some supplies for their own classrooms and say the district is paying all it can afford.

The district and the teachers, unable to reach an agreement on a base salary amount, will continue negotiations with a federal mediator on Oct. 18.

The survey, conducted last week by the Gooding Education Association, says that the fund balance is \$1,200,000. A summary of the poll, released to the press recently, states that Gooding teachers spend "significant amounts" of personal money each year to purchase classroom supplies and other necessities for their classrooms.

According to the summary, 80 percent of the teachers polled say their salary does not meet financial needs. Also, one in three teachers hold down a second job during the school year and more than half work outside their profession during the summer months.

In response to the survey, School Board Chairman Claude Major said the teaching profession lends itself to other jobs, especially during summer vacation.

Unfortunately, education does not pay as well as business (occupations)," she said. "I think this is the choice we make."

Lisa Hoffield, chief negotiator for the Gooding Education Association, said the poll substantiates a serious need for an increase in the salary schedule.

The teachers hold down second jobs because they need the income, not because they have so much spare time on their hands," Hoffield said.

The association survey reports that Gooding teachers spend nearly \$250 per teacher each year on classroom supplies for their students.

Major, however, said teachers' expenses in the elementary grades, by buying optional materials rather than essentials, are not the district's fault.

"When I was a teacher, I spent my own money, too," she said. "It isn't that they have to spend their own money."

The poll also shows that in the last two years, Gooding teachers spent about \$1,000 in extra money to go to school to upgrade their professional skills.

Hoffield and the state require 150 credits per teacher every five years and many school districts reimburse teachers for credits and tuition in addition to the salary schedule. An increase in Gooding's salary schedule would cover those expenses, she said.

Major said if teachers earn more credits, they would save money before Congress adjourns.

The National Parks Service held an informational meeting Wednesday to help explain the changes.

Due to the changes that went into effect with the legislation that made the area a refuge, hunters are no longer legal to hunt within the public land boundaries, Park Ranger Dave Pugh told an audience of about 15.

But islands of private land exist within the park and are legal to hunt.

Hunters, however, must be very aware of their location if they want to abide by the

laws. And hunters also must have their possession written permission from the land owners to hunt on the private land, he said.

Pugh explained that unless hunting rights are specifically written into a lease, hunting is not allowed.

Jeff Schrade, field representative for Sen. James McClure, who sponsored the bill that established the preserve, said that the legislation somehow missed that hunting would be allowed.

Schrade said McClure is upset about the situation and is currently working on legislation to allow hunting at the City of Rocks.

Though Schrade expressed optimism about changing the law soon, nothing can be done to salvage an open park hunting policy this year.

Most who spoke at the meeting protested that the place where they have hunted for 20 years has been closed. And they expressed support for a measure to reopen the park to hunting.

Buhl will resubmit grant application to pay water system costs

BUHL City Council members are making preparations to resubmit an application for a block grant to pay for improvements to the city's municipal water system.

Buhl's previous application for the grant, which is based on need, failed. But council members said they still believe Buhl has a good chance of getting a grant.

Part of Buhl's master water plan is to increase the size of water lines in several neighborhoods to achieve adequate fire protection, water volume and pressure. Fire hydrants are also on a list of priorities.

The city has committed \$80,000 as well as the manpower to complete the project. But it needs an additional \$37,000 in funds from the block grant.

The council has already authorized and committed city funds and manpower to complete the improvements to the city water system.

Dave Krueger, high school agriculture teacher, discussed plans with the council for an agriculture science and technology livestock lab at the high school and presented a new location better suited for water and sewer hook up and drainage.

Krueger said the vocational center teacher is anxious to get started on the foundation for this facility. The high school would like to finish the foundation this fall and finish the lab in the spring so it will be ready for the 1991 school year.

Council members requested Gary Winn, public works director, and Scott Bybee, city engineer, look at the new location and make sure the

school's plans are in compliance with Health and Welfare Department regulations. The pair will also check the new location's zoning for building use permit will be required.

2nd inmate pleads guilty in Holmes death

BOISE (AP) - A second Idaho prisoner has been convicted of the 1988 slaying of a 35-year-old woman, a drug dealer, branded a "snitch" and stabbed to death inside his cell.

Merle Lamere, who admitted helping a defendant, Rodney Schwartzman, but through a cinder block wall during a prison riot to the Holmes-pledged guilty to second-degree murder Wednesday in 4th District Court.

Despite the guilty plea, the 27-year-old Lamere told Judge Alan Schwartzman that he did not actually participate in the stabbing.

At the time of the slaying, the 35-year-old Holmes was being held in the Idaho State Penitentiary near Boise, serving a drug trafficking sentence and facing a murder charge in the kidnap slaying of a Canyon County narcotics informant.

Lamere said, "I helped to break into the cell. I stood there and watched when the stabbing happened and I did nothing to stop it."

When word spread behind bars, Holmes helped guide authorities to the informant's remains in the Owyhee County desert, he became a marked man.

Under the terms of the plea agreement, Ada County will transfer Lamere to Boise to face charges for a 1988 slaying of a woman.

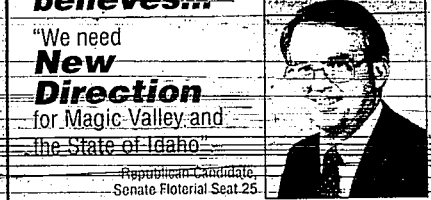

Magic Valley Budget may keep Craig from debate

TWIN FALLS — Scheduling candidate debates has not been an easy task this political season.

Ongoing budget talks in the nation's capital could delay Sunday's public television debate between Idaho's two U.S. Senate candidates. But on Thursday, a spokeswoman for the Idaho Press Club said 1st District Congressman Larry Craig has said he will make it to Idaho in order to discuss the issues with Democratic challenger Sean Maloney.

"As far as we know, it's a go," said Joan Carian, who is coordinating the debate schedule for the Idaho Press Club and the League of Women Voters.

The debate will air from 6 to 7 p.m. on Idaho Public Television, Channel 11 for public subscribers in the Twin Falls area.

Carian's schedule call to pieces last week when the public television network threw out Democratic Congressman Richard Stallings and Republican challenger Sean McDevitt, who was canceled at the last minute because Stallings could not escape the weekend's budget debate in Washington. That debate has been rescheduled for Oct. 27, giving McDevitt what he wanted all along — a late October debate that isn't on a Sunday.

Democratic vice-presidential pick Andrew Fairchild had their public television debate this week. But Fairchild is ready to do battle again.

In a press release Thursday, Fairchild criticized Andrus for refusing to engage in an Oct. 23 debate in Coeur d'Alene and an Oct. 29 debate in Twin Falls.

Referring to a panel which scored Andrus the winner in this week's debate, Fairchild said: "Although my opponent's skill at ducking and dodging tough issues may impress college debate students and some media lapdogs, it hardly impresses Idaho voters anxious for some straight answers."

Defense hits evidence in bomb trial

BOISE (AP) — Defense attorneys discounted the significance Thursday of a catalog with manuals on making "homemade" bombs, a guide to urban warfare and "The Cookbook" of gunpowder, and a Seattle street map seized by FBI agents from the homes of northern Idaho white supremacists.

But the government continued pressing its case in District Court that the items help prove a conspiracy by three members of the Church of Jesus Christ Christian-Aryan Nations to bomb a Seattle gay disco last spring.

The bombing never occurred, and the defense contends the plot was interrupted and thwarted by FBI informant Ron Renaldo Valentino to justify more than three years of fruitless undercover work.

Of the Seattle street map found May 12 at the home of defendant and former Senate candidate Stephen Nichols on the Arvan National "compound" near Hayden Lake, defense attorney Gar Hackney said, "I'm not sure how it fits in with the government's bomb-mission scenario."

Hackney also complained U.S. District Judge Harold Bean to pull a photo from evidence before Assistant U.S. Attorney Ron Howen could present it to the eight-woman four-man jury on the sixth day of testimony.

It showed Nazi flags on a wall at Nichols' home.

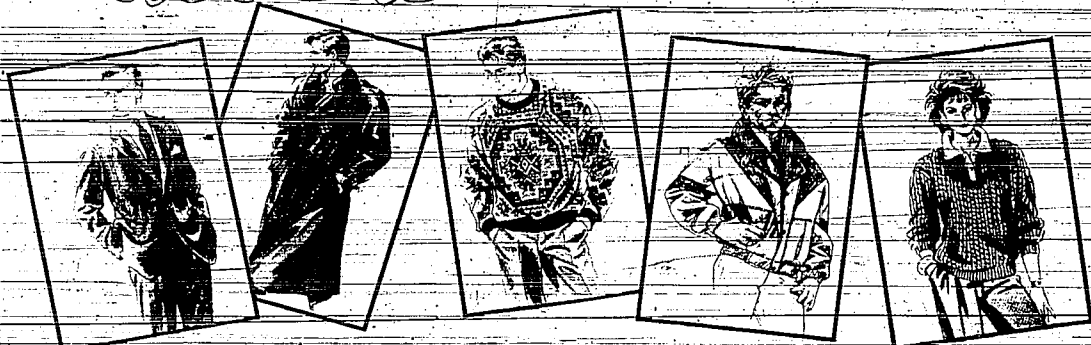
"There's no reason for that to be in there except for some inflammatory effect," the attorney said. "Mr. Howen knows that and that's what he's trying to do."

Nelson, Nichols and defendant Robert Winslow, 29, of LaCrosse, were arrested May 12 in Valentino's van outside a Seattle Super 8 motel. Defendant Procter James Bager, 58, of Coeur d'Alene, was arrested at home the same day.

Federal prosecutors allege they conspired to make pipe bombs with the intention of detonating them at Neighbors, a nightclub and restaurant with a predominantly gay clientele, as well as other black, Jewish and Korean targets in the Seattle area.

FBI and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms agents testified Thursday that they found about 25 pounds of gunpowder in Baker, Coeur d'Alene trailer house on May 12 and a pipe bomb containing a trace of gunpowder early the next day in a Bend, Ore., cabin.

Jones asks council to step into fish debate

BOISE — Idaho Attorney General Jim Jones has urged the Northwest Power Planning Council to step into the debate over the Northwest power management plan to preserve dwindling salmon and steelhead runs.

In a letter to the council's Fish and Wildlife Division Director Rick Applegate, Jones said all salmon and steelhead fishing should be prohibited in the Columbia and Snake rivers until enough fish have migrated through the hydro-power system to meet spawning needs.

Jones said the recent fish management plan adopted for the Columbia without Idaho's approval fails to sufficiently control commercial and tribal harvests of salmon and steelhead to ensure that production goals sought by the council are met.

The council's own proposal to integrate harvest and production goals "is an attempt to divide the river in two," he said, but offers no solutions.

He said the fishery management plan is being used as a harvest-oriented document to guarantee a high catch for Indian treaty commercial fishermen regardless of the impact on the number of fish able to escape upstream for spawning and continuation of that policy will "ensure fish harvest and steelhead recovery for federal protection to continue declining."

If the current long-range fish management plan is not modified, Jones maintained, "the council should consider seeking legislation that will set hard escapement goals at upper river dams that will be binding on both ocean and river harvest managers."

Without such an enforcement mechanism, he said, the council's proposal "will never be anything but a collection of empty promises."

Bengal fans chipping in to Wyche 'fine fund'

POST-INDUSTRIAL CITY Bengal fans are chipping in to help Sam Wyche pay the estimated \$27,500 fine imposed by the NFL for his refusal to let a female writer into the team's locker room.

The idea of a drive to raise the money for the fine was first mentioned on a radio talk show, and now a wide recruitment campaign that uses Wyche as a spokesman has placed an ad in Cincinnati's two daily newspapers, asking the public to contribute to the "Sam Wyche Fine Fund."

"It's just an idea I had after watching the game and seeing the controversy," said Mike Donovan, general manager of Nu Sash's Cincinnati office.



an idea called seemed to make it, and his choice would be a woman's free right decision for Sam to make.

"But out of about 40 to 50 calls, there were two against it and the rest were for it," Donovan said. He had not talked with Wyche about the ad, but was coordinating the collection with someone in Wyche's office.

"Although female writers have had access to the Bengals' locker room previously," Wyche has said, he has ruled it wasn't right to have women in the area where players were undressing. He was fined seven-eighths of his annual salary by NFL Commissioner Paul Tagliabue for violating league policy, allowing equal access to all accredited reporters.

The incident took place following a Monday night loss in Seattle. Wyche, who is active with projects for the homeless in Cincinnati, has said the NFL has assured him that the fine can be donated to charity.

"We're big fans of Sam and wanted to show our support. We think Sam's stand, stance and we ought to support him."

Thursday was the first day the two-inch-by-two-column ad appeared in the Cincinnati Enquirer and The Cincinnati Post.

"If you're a Bengals fan, show

Sam Wyche
Fine will be donated to charity you care," the ad said.

"We've already gotten a few calls," Donovan said. "A few didn't like the idea, but several did."

"There was one gentleman, who was a little disturbed sounding, who used a little bit of profanity. A woman

Bill Cunningham, a talk show host on WLW radio, was one of the first to urge fans to help pay Wyche's fine."

"I did it in order to help one of the finest American athletes," Cunningham said Thursday.

There has been a tremendous outpouring of love since Sam was given the fine, he said. "I think this is a moral issue, the kind of moral issue Cincinnati needs."

Cunningham said he's received about \$600 and expects to have \$1,000 by Friday, when the funds are being turned over to Wyche.

Calls have been 100 percent in favor of Sam, Cunningham said. "People are concerned not only with the wrongfulness of the commissioner's action, but the degree - a lot of people think \$27,500 is way out of line."

Patriots' GM says players should have known to avoid trouble

FOXBORO, MASS. (AP) - Whether they're at the grocery store in the afternoon or whether they're out at one in the morning and they need to understand that and they need to be able to face that.

Patrick Sullivan said they should know enough to avoid being provoked.

Starting wide receivers Hart Lee Dykes and Irving Fryar were injured early Wednesday outside the club's training facility.

"The problem is really exacerbated today because players go out on the street and people are not very kind to the situation right now," he added. Players "are going to be put in situations where they're out in the public, whether they're out at six o'clock at night

or whether they're at the grocery store in the afternoon or whether they're out at one in the morning and they need to understand that and they need to be able to face that."

"There was also the situation where guys were putting their careers on the line for what? So that they can win an argument in a bar?"

Capt. Dennis Gannon said Thursday Dykes probably was hit with a punch, but that hasn't been confirmed. He said it was "more than likely" someone would be charged in the assault, although no suspects had been taken into custody.

Sullivan said he would talk to Fryar and Dykes. He said any fines levied by the NFL would not be announced.

But he noted that his players were the people who were "in the line of fire." Sullivan said Fryar, 28, needed eight stitches to close a gash on the back of his head. Dykes, 24, was hospitalized for an eye injury and released Thursday.

Both are expected to play in the team's next game next Thursday at Miami. The Patriots are idle Sunday.

"One witness said Irving had hit the back of his head with his baseball bat," Sullivan said.

Miami basketball team faces struggle in Big East

MIAMI (AP) - On Leonard Hamilton's first full-fledged Big East basketball program, the Miami Hurricanes coach sounded like he wanted to call a timeout.

Thoughts of his new 1991-92 schedule may have had something to do with it.

This season, the Hurricanes will play teams such as Maryland in Anne Arundel County, Brooklyn College and Central Connecticut in other years, opponents will be from the same region but of a somewhat higher caliber - Big East caliber.

In his comments since Miami joined the league, Hamilton has expressed enthusiasm for the move. But at a luncheon Thursday to discuss his agreement for a season at Miami, he declined to speculate about

the impact of conference play on attendance, recruiting or the team's win-loss record.

"We're not going to concern ourselves with that," Hamilton said. "We're going to be competitive in the Big East. Hamilton said he was hired last April after four seasons at Oklahoma State, faces an uphill struggle. Miami has averaged less than 2,000 fans per game since the basketball program was resurrected in 1985 after a 15-year hiatus.

Competition against Big East teams will not be entirely new to Hamilton. In 1985-86, he coached with at Providence and lost to Georgetown by four points. Last season they lost to Providence by 15 and Georgetown by 33.

GM vows to leave Vikes with smooth transition

MINNETONKA, Minn. (AP) - Mike Lynn has controlled almost every aspect of the Minnesota Vikings for the last 6 1/2 years, making him perhaps the NFL's most powerful general manager. So when he leaves soon to join the NFL's new international spring league, it would seem to signal a complete restructuring of the Vikings.

But Lynn said Thursday he would do everything within his considerable power to ensure a smooth transition and that includes the status of coach Jerry Burns, whom Lynn promised would be retained as his successor.

Lynn also points the title of executive vice president and who controls two-thirds of the Vikings' voting stock, told a news conference he wasn't sure exactly when he would leave Minnesota to concentrate on the World League of American Football.

Lynn would replace Tex Schramm as WLAF president. Schramm, long-time Dallas Cowboys president and general manager, was fired Tuesday.

"I'm not going to put a timetable on this," Lynn said. "I would like to move as rapidly as possible to have a smooth transition and unravel everything that needs to be unraveled. I would like for that to occur very quickly. That's my goal. It's never been through anything like this before. And I really don't

know how long it's going to take. The same question was asked by various members of the board of the World League and that's exactly the way I answered it. I really don't know."

Lynn, whose Minnesota contract expires Dec. 31, said he has the authority to hire his successor immediately.

"I don't want to do that," he said. "I think that would upset a number of people."

Lynn has been the central figure in a five-year power struggle over control of the team. He has been with the Vikings since 1974 and was named coach in 1983. But it wasn't until 1984, when he maneuvered to force team founder Max Winter out of the picture, that he gained control.

Carl Pohlad, a Minneapolis banker and owner of the Minnesota Twins baseball team, and Minneapolis businessman Frank Glendon have bought Winter's one-third voting stock. They also own more than half of the team's voting stock. They have been trying to take control of the team and Lynn ousted, but Lynn is backed by owners of the other two thirds, John Skoglund and the Bill Hooper estate.

Lynn said he hoped his exit would lead to settlement of the ownership struggle, a sentiment echoed by team president Wheelock Whitney, a Lynn ally.

U.S. chooses slower red clay surface for Davis Cup final

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. (AP) - In selecting a slower play surface for several leading American players were eliminated, including John McEnroe and the Open stars will produce a Davis Cup victory over Australia in the finals Nov. 30-Dec. 2.

U.S. captain Tom Gorman is counting on the slower surface to help Chang, Leach and Jim Bugh, the same foursome that beat Austria in the semifinals - to put together another winning effort on the slow, compacted red brick dust surface that should favor the Americans.

The original deadline was Oct. 2 and the Australians were miffed that the announcement still didn't come by the time the seven-day extension expired Tuesday.

"I think that the Australians knew the day after (the United States) 3-2 Skoff in the deciding match in the semifinals that we could be doing this. It hasn't been a total secret," Gorman said.

The United States in the finals for the first time since 1986, has won 28 Davis Cup titles - the last in 1982. The last time the Americans played a home match on clay was in a 3-2 Challenge Round victory over Romania in 1971.

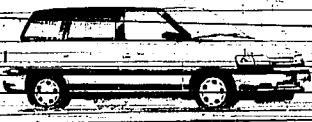

THE ACES ON BRIDGE BOBBY WOLFE

Plans get you into things, but you got to work your way out.

South chose a crossruff plan for today's minor-suit game, and he was right. Unfortunately he made one small slip, enough to cost him the vulnerable game.

After winning the second heart, South counted his possible winners. Even if trumps proved to be 2-2, he would still need two more tricks to go with six trumps, two aces and the

trumping. And if trumps weren't 2-2, he would have even more problems. Obviously the best plan was to crossruff rather than draw trumps.

The spade ace was cashed, and a spade was ruffed in dummy. A

spade was discarded on dummy's diamond ace, and a low diamond was ruffed by South. Another spade was

ruffed with dummy's jack, but East interrupted with an overruff. East returned his last trump to eliminate

another dummy ruff, and South was left with only 11 tricks.

The key to 11 winners lies with avoiding an overruff. Since South can afford to lose a late trump trick but not an early one, he must be

careful to ensure a dummy ruff for all three of his losing spades. Therefore, he cannot ruff a trump with dummy's jack-of-trumps. Instead he

must ruff the second time with the ace. After that, he returns to his hand via another ruff (high, for emphasis) and ruffs his last spade with the trump jack.

East gets the trump-queen as before, but only at a time of South's choice.

The American People is protesting the NEA on television, claiming that House Democrats are opposing his amendment would face the wrath of voters in the Nov. 6 congressional elections.

He said the compromise bill was a fraudulent "political fix" that would do nothing to halt the flow of offensive art allegedly subsidized by the endowment.

Shorter, Chick Corea and Chuck Mangione).

Joining Ferguson Wednesday will be Cliff Brubeck, bass; Matt Wallace and Glen Koslar, saxophone; Keith Oshiro, trombone; Peter Olstead and Craig Johnson, trumpet; Christian Jacob, piano, who recently won the National Jazz Piano Contest in Florida; and Chris Brown on drums.

Ferguson can be hired working with High Voltage, his fusion group of the 1980s, "but suddenly I really began missing the real acoustic horn players. That's what I've put back into the band," he said.

"The electronic things are fun to add to a band, but my viewpoint but just going with a predominately electronic band is really not my thing," he said. "I'm enjoying very much what I'm doing right now."

Well known for what jazz educators Journal called his "high register trumpet" work, Ferguson started playing trumpet at age 16 with the blessings of his parents—both educators—Ferguson dropped out of school after he had landed a seven-day-a-week gig fronting a band of players twice his age.

Although Ferguson is deeply dedicated to music education, and he opens many

residences and clinics with high school and college students. Asked what advice he gives to young musicians, Ferguson "defers to Leonard Bernstein."

"He said, 'If you have to ask anybody, 'Should I be a musician?' the answer should be no,'" Ferguson recalled.

"That's really true," he said. "I made my career decision when I was 9 years of age. That's a real stupid time in life to make a career decision, but I knew that's what I wanted to do."

He likened a band leader's task to that of a football or baseball coach, noting that it takes different skills to lead instead of play. "We forget that Glenn Miller, for instance, was a fourth trombonist," he said. "Being a band leader is a separate talent and has nothing to do with your personal playing."

TWIN FALLS—The Herrett Museum continues its celebration of Idaho's 100th birthday with "Centennial Edition" by Anderson/Kagan/Scott. An exhibition opening Tuesday on the College of Southern Idaho campus.

The public is invited to an opening reception for the artists set for 7 p.m. Tuesday at the museum.

Bethanne Anderson of Boise works primarily in acrylics and pastels. Her images are frequently animals that she combines with abstract patterns. Anderson holds both bachelor's and master's degrees from Brigham Young University. She has exhibited widely, with one-woman shows at

the Sun Valley Center, Ricks College, the Art Attack Gallery in Boise and Brigham Young University.

Her work was recently included in the traveling "Spirit of the West" exhibition sponsored by West One Bank.

Rod Kagan is a Ketchum sculptor and 1990 recipient of the Governor's Award for Excellence in the Arts.

One of the state's most prominent sculptors, he has exhibited widely with one-woman shows at the Boise Art Museum, the Herrett Museum and the Schneider Museum in Ashland, Ore.

Kagan is known for his totem and column sculptures that he manufactures primarily out of bronze. The

works are usually done in editions of six and in several sizes. Kagan received a National Endowment for the Arts fellowship in 1984.

Gail Larson, a Potlatch metal-smith, is currently chairwoman of the art department at Idaho State University.

She is known for her fabricated jewelry and metal containers that she raises from sheets of copper or brass. Her works, although functional, are very sculptural in conception.

Most recently, Larson has been working with refractory metals like titanium and niobium.

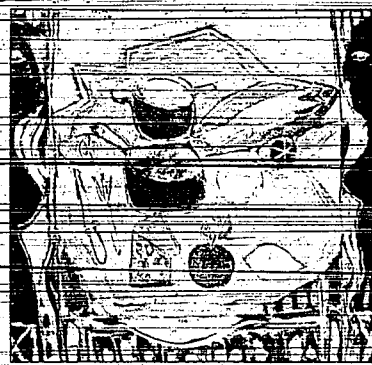
By electroplating these metals, she is able to create a variety of colors. She was one of the curators re-

sponsible for the "Spirit of the West" show.

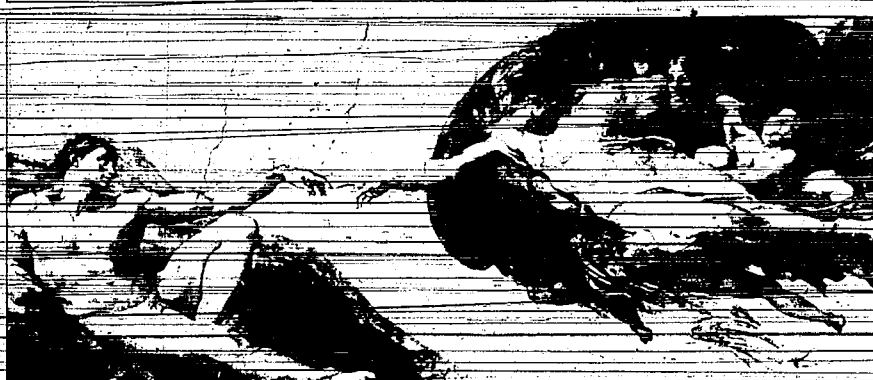

Physician sees God giving gift to man in restored Michelangelo masterpiece

CHICAGO (AP)—Art historians are split over a doctor's theory that Michelangelo's "Creation of Adam" on the Sistine Chapel ceiling contains a huge image of a brain, symbolizing God endowing man with intelligence.

Dr. Frank Lynn Meshberger contends the fresco has been misunderstood since it was created in 1512.

The painting was covered with dirt until a recent restoration, so it might have been difficult to visualize a brain, he said.

The painting shows Adam and God reaching toward one another, arms outstretched, fingers almost touching.

God has his arm around Eve, and angels look on. God and the angels form the shape of the brain, Meshberger said.

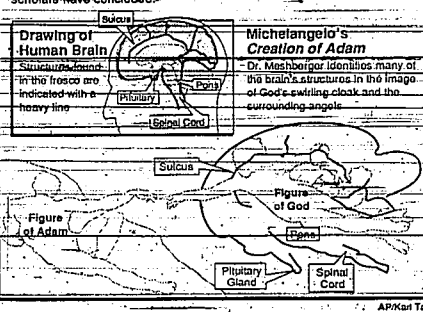
Meshberger, a gynecologist at St. John's Medical Center in Anderson, Ind., said in today's Journal of the American Medical Association that Michelangelo intended to symbolize God giving man "intellect," rather than life, as commonly believed.

Kathleen Well-Garris Brandt, fine arts professor at New York University and a consultant for Renaissance art at the Vatican Museums, disputed Meshberger's theory as a "rebirth" of his own knowledge.

"All the elements in the image have profound traditional roots in the visual culture of the Renaissance and Middle Ages," she said. "God is more than a flying brain."

The Brain on the Sistine Ceiling

Other art historians are reluctant to dismiss the theory, noting that artists and scientists of the time studied sections of the brain.

Meshberger said he learned through his research that Michelangelo had deep religious beliefs and dissected cadavers to study the human form for his art.

"The idea of God being equated with the mind is quite attractive," said Graham Smith, who specializes in 16th-century art at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.

Lynn Orr, curator of European art at the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco, said, "Anybody can look at artwork and say, 'Oh, that means such and such to me,' but that's one of the wonderful things about art."

"I guess the thing to do now is for a bunch of people to look at the picture carefully to see if it really does look like a brain," she said.

Meshberger said the theory came to him after he dissected and drew a brain in medical school in 1969.

He said he saw a three-page fold-out photograph of the painting in a magazine and "had a tremendous sense of deja vu." "I like to think of it as a brainstorm," he joked.

Meshberger said he waited 20 years to publish an article on it because he was establishing himself as a doctor and had little time to research Michelangelo.

Meshberger said that the painting also includes a representation of the vertebral artery, which feeds blood to the brain, and that a cleft-footed angel forms the two lobes of the pituitary gland.

For centuries, art lovers did not have the benefit of clear photography, and artists who would have had access to the painting generally were not skilled in the study of anatomy, the doctor said.

"For someone to make this observation, you would have had to travel to Rome to the Sistine Chapel, stand on the floor and look up at a ceiling about 65 feet away," he said.

Ancient treasures return home

VITERBO, Italy (AP) - After decades behind the Iron Curtain, hundreds of Etruscan artifacts have returned to Italy in a major show from museums in Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union.

The 1,700 artifacts, which were nearly inaccessible to Westerners for decades, have come home to central Italy, where the Etruscan culture flourished until the 1st century B.C. The exhibit is being hailed as a chance for scholars and the public to rediscover Etruscan masterpieces hidden away for decades.

It also is seen as a sign of exciting times to come in the art world, as the recent boom of Russian Empire EGgin-to-teaching exhibits has convinced the world of its value.

This brings together an extraordinary number of masterpieces that were very little known, said Maria PalloTTino, president of the National Institute of Italian Etruscan Studies. It's something of exceptional importance.

The exhibit in a Gothic castle in Viterbo, 50 miles north of Rome, was organized by the State Museum of Berlin.

It includes Etruscan artifacts from 26 museums in Poland, Hungary, Czechoslovakia and the former East Germany, as well as the Soviet Union.

The Etruscans were a powerful empire that dominated Italy before succumbing to the Roman Empire. They were known for commercial flair, an elaborate religion and a brilliant artistic tradition, which included the finest goldwork in ancient Europe.

The Viterbo show brings together a wide range of Etruscan artifacts, ranging from a simple ceramic urn-shaped like a house, dating from the 9th century B.C., to elaborately carved sarcophagi from the 2nd and 3rd centuries B.C.

The highlights include the contents of an 8th century B.C. tomb of a man known as the Warrior of Tarquinia. Among the 144 pieces are engraved bronze shields, weapons, bracelets, rings and even a razor for the athlete.

Another rare item is the "Lile of Capua," a 5th century B.C. plaque with writing believed to be part of a funeral ritual. It is the second longest existing piece of Etruscan writing, which scientists have never succeeded in translating.

Several carved stone and alabaster sarcophagi with scenes of battles or the trip to the afterlife illustrate the Etruscans' talent for sculpture. On top of a few lies a likeness of the dead person, often propped up on one elbow as if to enjoy a good Etruscan meal.

Also in the exhibit is gold jewelry,

including tiny earrings etched to resemble shields or hammers of war. From the 3rd to 5th centuries B.C., Many Etruscan treasures wound up in German and Russian hands in the 19th century, before Italy passed a law limiting exports. Germans in particular, did much of the early research in the Etruscans and were interested in acquiring the pieces.

Many of the items in the exhibit were difficult for Westerners to see during Communist rule in Eastern Europe, due to the difficulty of obtaining tourist visas.

"Even some of our experts hadn't seen them," said Carlo Maria Cardoni, director of the exhibit. For the Italian organizers, the novelty of having treasures from Eastern European museums was matched by search in the Etruscans and were interested in acquiring the pieces.

Their architect still goes around with a wooden ruler and a pencil, said Cardoni, shaking his head.

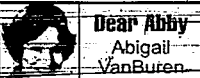

Cimino's 'Desperate Hours' is in desperate straits

Michael Cimino's "Desperate Hours" begins with a long sequence in which the beautiful young actress Kelly Lynch, her blond hair flying

...rains across the picturesque state of Utah in her hair, rippling up a shroud of dust, ratcheting through gears, insinuating left and right, bounding over hill and dale. She must be fleeing the coppers or racing to the hospital to give birth. But no. She's trying to catch the bus. Well, she makes it to the bus, but the movie itself never does. A clumsy, not-very-well-thought-out version of the classic Humphrey Bogart-Fredric March "hostage melodrama" battle from the mid-'30s, this one sure didn't know as an escaped convict who takes over a suburban house with his gang, and Anthony Hopkins as the man of the house. Of rather, the ex-man of the house, one of Cimino's tropes is to

update the materials, so that the stolid middle-class March character is now very '90s; the house is about to be sold, because divorce is im-

in Heaven" but "fortysomething." A few other updates: the Rourke character is now imagined in the image of Jack Henry Abbott, the literary convict whom a great many people who should have known better would love to see from prison, after which he promptly killed a man. Rourke's character has even attended (by correspondence, one assumes) the Johns Hopkins Writing Seminars! But nothing ever comes of it.

And the Dad is now a Vietnam war veteran, but nothing ever comes of it, either. And a final, absurdist touch: The mid-mannered FBI agent in the original has become female, in the form of a indy Coeur, masquerading behind a Southern accent. As before, she represents the Bureau's liberal wing, and doesn't want the stakeout team to go tactical, that is, kick down the door and start shoot-

ing. She won't even authorize a sniper to pull the trigger when he's got Rourke sitting on a night-laser beam that represents instant capital punishment. Her character makes no sense at all.

But then nobody makes sense. The Lynch character really doesn't exist in the screenplay except as a sex object (Cimino loves to look up or down her dress or blouse) and her conversation to the FBI agents in the late going comes from nowhere. It does her participation in the extremely messy and incoherent film may

This movie, R-rated, essentially has two characters, Rourke and Hopkins, who are so funny they don't get out of every day (including Keanu Reeves as the wife and Elias Koteas as Rourke's brother).

Neither actor is particularly convincing, but Rourke, with his smugness, megalomania and lip-smacking self-love really reaches new heights of repugnance. It's somewhat funny to watch the screenplay shuffle through the devices of the original, but always to

worse, rather than better advantage. For example, at a key moment in the original, March went back into his house with an empty gun and used it as a ploy to completely turn the tables on Bogart.

So Cimino has two empty guns—empty, that is, far from all of them, then after going to great trouble to establish it.

And the story just isn't well told. He insists on shooting all the law enforcement conferences in a state of high hubbub, with a lot of swirling camera motion and cutting back ground noise and action. The result isn't "reality" but incoherence—you can't hear what's going on, so you can't make the key connections with the plot and you never understand how the feds who seem so stupid, catch up so fast. It's just a mess.

FLATLINERS (R)—Some lines shouldn't be crossed: some movies shouldn't be watched. No, that's not easy. This Joel Schumacher film, in which five photogenic med students decide to experience death and alter life scientifically, is eminently watchable, gloriously aflame with swanky deep-focus decor. But it's built around the kind of spiritual junksters sell Mercedes with. The theme is like a little dry pea rattling through the very cooling museum of the high-tech machine. Why should anyone risk death to see the afterlives depicted here when they can get the same stuff from cable TV?

DIEST (PG-13)—The movie's slogan is "Believe, not an unrealistic request. But even those who'd be happy to comply must pass a certain, sane, sound-mindedness to its certain—and a production, prettified to the point of being watched. With some of its actors Demi Moore as the cracked-voice, desolate—lover, Whoopi Goldberg as an extremely reluctant spirit go-between and Vincent Schiavelli as an insouciant, subway-dwelling ghost—things are in the

best hands possible. But Patrick Swayze as a corporate New York banker? Never in 7 million corporate years.

POSTCARDS FROM THE EDGE (R)—Curric Fisher's adaptation of Robert De Niro, Ray Liotta, Lorraine Bracco, Paul Sorvino—is perfect from its starts to its smallest bit players, but watch especially for Joe Pesci's violent, volatile mephisto.

PRETTY WOMAN (R)—Updating the old-fashioned and smirking it w. Cinderella dust may seem like a perfectly workable idea, until you get into the nuts and bolts of "Pretty Woman." Here, Richard Gere's bored cipher of a corporate raider transforms Julia Roberts' happy Hollywood beauty into a time and time again can pass off at a polo match in less than a week. This is a movie that barely has a moment to call its own and the ones it has are gamy, materialistic and possibly life-threatening. Some fairy tale for the '90s.

YOUNG GUNS II (PG-13)—There haven't been many movie Westerns with this much sheer visual energy

and excitement since Peckinpah and Leone were in their '70s prime. The brilliant New Zealand action director (Gael Murphy "Gija"), assigned the sequel to Walter "Dirt Dave" Miller's "The Billy the Kid" legend, makes a rare full of sound, gunfire, fury and scorchingly beautiful landscapes. Emilio Estevez is closer than any previous Billy to the look of the sawed-off-impish killer and the cast is denser than ever.

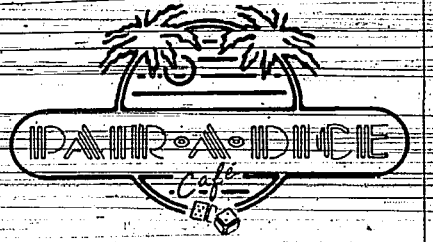
Though overall, this variation pales next to Peckinpah's in 1973. It's Murphy and cinematographer Dean "Mad Max" Semler, who make it special.

Stocks drop sharply for 3rd straight session, hit 18-month low

 NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market dropped sharply for the third straight session Thursday, hitting an 18-month low in afternoon trading as investors awaited the report on corporate earnings for the third quarter over the next couple of weeks.
 But economic weakness hasn't so far brought any downward pressure on long-term interest rates.
 Recession worries have kept mounting of late as investors await the peak flow of corporate earnings reports for the third quarter over the next couple of weeks.
 The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks fell 42.82 to 2,365.10, bringing its loss over the past three days to 158.66 points. That marked the lowest close for the average since it stood at 2,337.79 on April 17, 1989.
 Declining issues outnumbered advancing ones by 4 to 1 nationwide trading of issues, including trades in those stocks on the New York Stock Exchange-listed stocks, regional exchanges and in the over-the-counter market, totaled 219.03 million shares. Volume on the floor of the Big Board came to 180.06 million shares, against 167.89 million in the previous session. The price of crude oil for November delivery climbed \$1.73 a barrel to \$44.24 a barrel, the New York Mercantile Exchange.

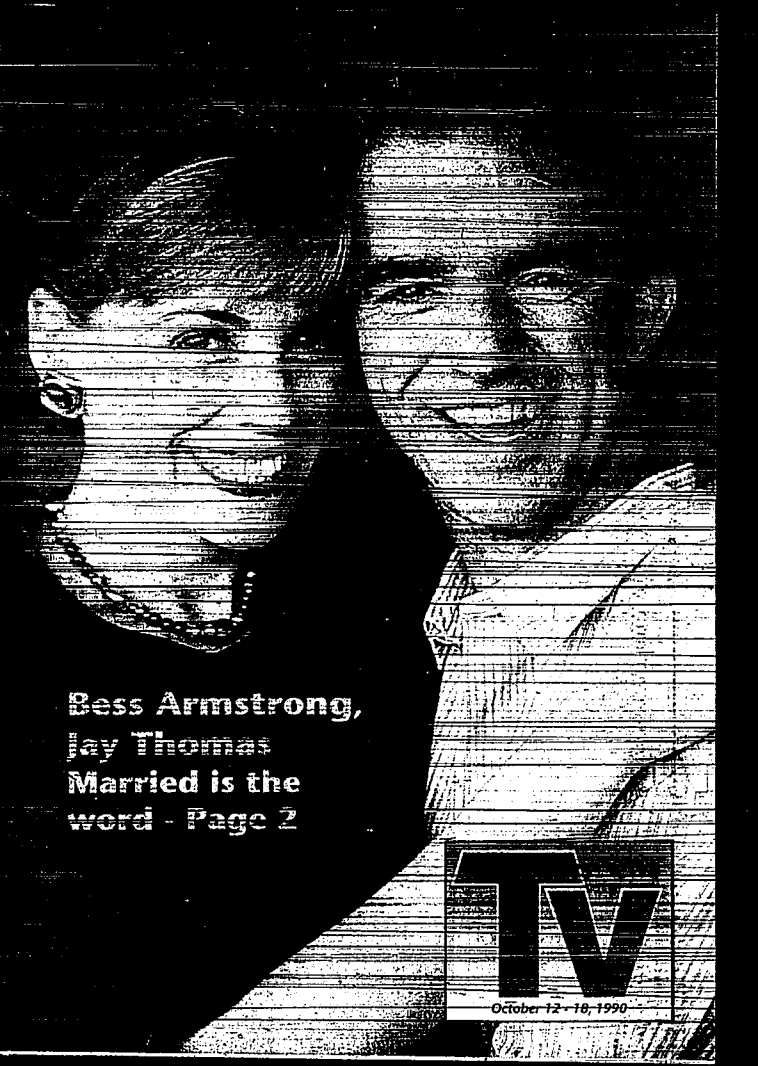

Three couples share a brownstone as ABC takes a look at marriage

Eating establishments are unlikely places for actors to find their big break. But for Jay Thomas, a dinner at a local restaurant led to his opportunity of a lifetime—a lead in a new television series.

"I was sitting in a neighborhood restaurant, and I noticed two people kept staring at me," says Thomas. "I usually don't mind people staring, because I'm known from my radio show and my television appearances. But I overheard them say, 'Hey, there's Jay Thomas. He would be good. Let's bring him in.' It turned out that they were Robert Sternin and Prudence Fraser, a married team who were the creators of a new series called 'Married People.' They asked me to come read for them. I did, and I got the job."

"Married People," which airs Wednesdays on ABC, centers on three couples who share a Harlem brownstone. Thomas plays freelance writer Russell Meyers, who lives in the second-floor apartment with his pregnant wife, Elizabeth (Bess Armstrong), an attorney. In the ground-floor apartment are the building's owners, Nick and Olivia Williams (Ray Aranha and Barbara Montgomery), a black couple who have been married over 30 years. And in the attic apartment are newlyweds Allen and Cindy Campbell (Chris Young and Megan Gallivan), who only have eyes for each other.

"Hopefully the writers will deal with what it's like for these yuppie types to live in Harlem," says Thomas. "At this point, the writers are dealing with the interior of the

building and the personalities of the six of us. Although the Williams saved their money to buy the building, they have to deal with the fact that most of their friends have moved away. The newlyweds will become more New York-aware. And Russell and Elizabeth are probably going to have that baby-sometime this season. It will be interesting to see Russell deal with the arrival of this new baby, because he won't be the center of attention any more. So there are a lot of questions to be answered."

Off-screen, Thomas is also a Los Angeles morning disc jockey. "I work from 5:30 to 9," he says. "Married People has made a deal that I come to work at 10:30."

Thomas also has the knack of extending one-time appearances into recurring roles. He is well-known for his role as hockey player Eddie

LeGec, the one-time husband of Carla, on NBC's "Cheers," and Candice Bergen's one-time on-screen love interest, Jerry Gold, on CBS's "Murphy Brown." His portrayal of Gold led to a recent Emmy nomination, and he is scheduled for another episode on the CBS series.

Gold just might take another trip to that restaurant. "It's funny, I recently did a voiceover for a TV show," he says. "And someone approached me and he said, 'You know, I saw you in a restaurant.' So it's happened twice. I think when I want to do movies, I'm going to start hanging out in those two restaurants again. This time, I hope for the producers to be there."

Does 'Generations' need a makeover?

What would you do with "Generations" if you were running daytime programming at NBC? Would you expand the show to an hour so it could compete? Would you grab the spotlight with a sensational black-white story, a ploy known in the trade as stunting? Or would you give the show a break by switching time slots, seeking easier opposition before throwing in the towel?

Robert Torti, who plays the by-the-book cop Lt. Kyle Masters, would like to see an hour edition and a new time slot. "We've got a following," said Torti, "and we don't need stunting. The stories are O.K., and so is the acting. What we need is trust and an even playing field. I think the problem is political."

An actor who worked behind Hollywood cameras on the crew, Torti was used to crews doing their job for the money and being bored by the show. But, as Torti said, the "Generations" crew likes the show. Some say it's the best job in town. That tells me something. I used to crew for Stanley. Involvement in the show means something is working right."

Frank comments from an actor can mean dissatisfaction over meager air time. But Torti's Kyle Masters is always in the thick of plotting, heavily involved with Kelly Rutherford's erratic Sam Whitmore, at the same time, chasing the bad guys. At the moment Sam and Kyle have broken off, but that can change overnight.

Playing a stubborn, one-sided cop born to the job — a man who doesn't like what he sees on the street and thinks he can make a difference, Torti has accumulated a following. Letters come from Death Row on the one side and from fans split over the Kyle-Sam romance. Many think Sam is using Kyle or that she's not good enough for him. In any case, Kyle isn't a rat or a fall guy.

And then there are those who just want a photo. Torti takes a more original approach than most of his peers. "They can see me on the air," said Torti, "but I can't see the fans. I would like photos of the viewers, so

I can see what they're like. The process ought to be reversed.

Caught by the show and its possibilities, Torti sees promise, and some hope ahead.

"I do my job," he said. "We have something important here, and we have a following. I just wish the network would stop playing it safe."

of color and all Americans."

Nielsen race is a close one this season but it's still three cheers for 'Cheers'

LOS ANGELES (AP) — For the third week of the fall season, "Cheers" was the most-watched show on television, and its parent, NBC, squeaked past its competition for the top-rated network spot.

Since the Sept. 17 opening of television's new season, the overall network race has been separated by less than a ratings point. The latest ratings released Monday by the Nielsen Co. were no different, showing NBC in first with a 11.9 average, followed by ABC with 12.0 and CBS with 12.3. Each ratings point represents 41,000 homes.

CBS slipped to third after finishing No. 1 during fall premiere week. The network's first-ever baseball playoff coverage provided only lackluster ratings for CBS last week.

The second game of the American League playoff battle between Oakland and Boston, broadcast Sunday, ranked 28th in the Nielsen standings. The first game of the National League playoffs between Cincinnati and Pittsburgh, broadcast Thursday, ranked 51st.

In the network news battle, ABC and Peter Jennings placed first with a 10.2 average, followed by NBC and Tom Brokaw with 8.5. CBS and

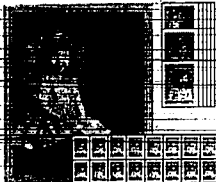

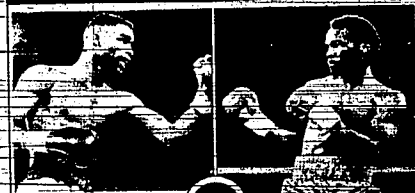
