Dump wins OK

WASHINGTON — The Environmental Protection Agency gave its approval Thursday for the limited disposal of radioactive waste from nuclear weapons plants at a Energy Department site in New Mexico.

The EPA action clears the way for the Energy Department to begin a disposal of hazardous waste critical five-year test of the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant near Carlsbad, N.M., the plant eventually is hoped to be the nation's first permanent repository for low and medium-level atomic wastes.

Energy Secretary James Watkins has said he planned to begin shipping drums of radioactive wastes from government weapons plants to the New Mexico plant next January. The wastes in question are not only radioactive but are also chemically hazardous.

The EPA, which must approve the disposal of hazardous waste, whether radioactive or not, said the permit for the test program was being given under the conditions that the waste be limited to 8,500 drums and that they be retrievable.

Wendell man faces murder charge in shooting

GOODING — A 19-year-old Wendell man was charged with second-degree murder and the use of a firearm to commit a felony Thursday in connection with the Halloween shooting of 40-year-old William Davis.

Wil Beaver appeared in 5th District Court before Judge Thomas Cushman Thursday where he was charged with shooting Davis in the face and chest with a 12-gauge shotgun. Davis died at the scene.

The shooting occurred Wednesday night at 108 Ave. C East in a home owned by Beaver's mother and grandmother.

Beaver called police after the shooting at about 8:32 p.m., and surrendered without incident, said Gooding County Prosecutor Lynn Nelson. More than one shot was fired, but Nelson said he didn't know how many.

If convicted of the murder charge, Beaver faces a prison sentence of 10 years to life. The firearm charge could add 15 years to the prison term.

A preliminary hearing has been scheduled for 9:30 a.m. Nov. 9 at the Gooding County Courthouse. The court will determine then if the state has enough evidence to take the case to trial.

Beaver is being held in the Gooding County Jail in lieu of \$100,000 bond.

Public defender Steven Swenson was appointed to represent Beaver and can request a bond reduction hearing at any time.

The bond amount is typical of murder cases and reflects the fact that Beaver has few connections with the area, Nelson said. According to neighbors and employees at Smedley's Market, where Beaver's mother worked, the family recently moved here from California.

Beaver about 5 feet 11 inches tall with wavy, shoulder-length, darkwater-blond hair and a blue of a mustache, showed no emotion when he was led, unshackled, into the courtroom.

Idaho Democrats file FEC complaint about McDevitt campaign financing

The Idaho Democratic Party filed a complaint Thursday with the Federal Election Commission, alleging that Republican Sean McDevitt of Pocatello is illegally financing his campaign against Democratic Rep. Richard Stangor.

The complaint contends McDevitt improperly received a \$30,000 loan from his family, and that he has been receiving family contributions in excess of the amount allowed by federal election laws.

McDevitt already has acknowledged the loan and has promised to repay, Beyond that, he called the accusations "absurd and another example of the tactics he (Stangor) is willing to use. I welcome an investigation."

In a complaint signed by Democratic Chairman Conley Ward, Democrats called for penalties against McDevitt for his election law violations and an agreement that they would not meet again.

The complaint alleged:

- That on Oct. 10, Thomas and Bruna McDevitt, the candidate's parents, loaned \$30,000 to the campaign. Ward said under federal laws, a loan is considered a contribution, and that the loan must be considered a contribution. The loan is far over the contribution limit of \$1,000 for each individual.
- That a family corporation, Little Red Hen Inc.-of Pocatello, has provided office space, a pickup truck and other help for the campaign, without being listed under McDevitt's contribution.

The complaint said McDevitt's father is president of the corporation and Sean McDevitt is vice president.

The complaint alleged the help provided to the McDevitt campaign either is a corporate donation, forbidden by federal law, or is in excess of the allowable amounts.

Sean McDevitt has appeared, avoiding paying for any of these benefits of running a campaign by appropriating the facilities of Little Red Hen, Inc. As evidenced

85 may be tops for life expectancy

WASHINGTON — Humans may soon expect an average lifetime of 85 years, but probably not much more, even if medical science defeats all of the major killer diseases, researchers say.

An average life expectancy of four score and five may be the upper limit because the human body by then is slowly deteriorating from a cascade of aging effects, University of Chicago researchers, S. Jay Olshansky, said Thursday.

And science, he said, has yet to find a way to overcome this apparent design of nature.

"Even if we found a cure for most fatal diseases, such as heart disease and cancer, the natural degeneration of the body puts a cap of about 85 years on the average age of death," Olshansky and two co-authors report in the current issue of the Journal Science.

Other experts on human aging, however, strongly disagree. "We have made it in the past. Then a baby born today can expect to live 100 years," said James Vampel of the University of Minnesota. "There may well be some biological barriers, but we've broken them and the scientists are poised to break some really significant breakthroughs."

Campaigner Bush continues tough talk

ORLANDO, Fla. — President Bush sharply attacked Saddam Hussein from the campaign trail Thursday, saying that Iraqi brutalities in the Persian Gulf rivaled those under Adolf Hitler and adding anew to "see his aggression burned back."

"I don't think the status quo can go on forever," Bush said. "I don't know how long it is long enough to depend on sanctions alone to force Iraq's withdrawal from Kuwait."

At the end of a long day of angry rhetoric directed at Saddam, Bush said "I'm not trying to sound the tocsin of war."

His spokesman said the president was speaking out "to prepare the American people for any eventuality."

Marlin Fitzwater said, "If we do have to take dramatic action, we want them to know why."

Bush spent his day campaigning from Massachusetts to Florida for Republican candidates in next week's elections, and blending his political activity with remarks focused on the Persian Gulf crisis. He flew to Cincinnati Thursday night to get in position to campaign for Ohio Republicans on Friday.

At his news conference in Orlando, Bush said it was a "little bit awkward because we are a few days before an election and I want to continue to work for Republican candidates."

At the same time, he said he wanted to keep the American people informed about his feelings in the Persian Gulf, where more than 200,000 Americans are deployed.

Bush was asked about his wife's comments that he would be willing to meet with Saddam to resolve the crisis. He didn't exactly embrace the idea, but said his position at any such meeting would be "No condition, no negotiation, just leave Kuwait."

Former HUD head misled Congress

WASHINGTON — Former Housing Secretary Samuel Pierce misled Congress about his involvement in abuses at HUD, including steering money to political friends, congressional investigators concluded Thursday.

The report by a House committee left unanswered whether Pierce broke any federal laws or committed perjury in his testimony over oath last year, saying a special prosecutor would pursue those questions.

But it said there was evidence that Pierce and other HUD officials concealed the full nature and extent of abuses at the Department of Housing and Urban Development, where Pierce was secretary through the eight years of the Reagan administration.

Haitians fight on flee from island

MIAMI — Haitian refugees jammed into an overloaded sailboat, and rescuers that 10 passengers were thrown overboard before a patrol found the survivors Thursday, a U.S. Coast Guard spokesman said.

The Haitians were battling each other when the cutter Northland pulled alongside about 6 a.m. just 20 miles north of Haiti, said Lt. Cmdr. Jeff Karonis. "They were fighting not with us, but among themselves," said Karonis, who added it was not immediately known what sparked the fighting or the alleged drownings.

Cholesterol research holds promise

WASHINGTON — A disorder that causes high cholesterol levels and early heart attacks was corrected in rabbits using a gene transfer technique that researchers believe may eventually cure the rare genetic flaw in humans.

In a study published Thursday in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, researchers reported they were able to transfer into rabbit liver cells a gene that temporarily corrected an inherited defect called familial hypercholesterolemia.

Consumer debt could worsen recession

WASHINGTON — American consumers' debt binge during the 1980s increases the likelihood the next recession will be long and deep, a federal policy research group said Thursday.

"If we do experience a recession, its impact will be much more severe than if consumer debt were at a lower level," said University of California-Irvine's economic professor Robert Pollin.

Halloween escape trick turns tragic

FRESNO, Calif. — A clear plastic coffin buried under 6 feet of dirt and wet concrete for a Halloween escape trick collapsed under the weight and killed the would-be Houdini locked inside with chains and handcuffs. About 150 people, including the magician's children and wife, watched as onlookers frantically dug at the dirt and cement to try to rescue Joseph Burns.

McDonald's to stop using plastic foam

CHICAGO (AP) — The plastic foam boxes that cradle millions of Big Macs and other sandwiches are being eliminated, McDonald's said Thursday.

Under pressure from environmental groups, which say the chemicals leach into the nation's overflowing garbage crisis, McDonald Corp. President Edward Reisi said the company had decided "to do what's right."

"Although some scientific studies indicate that foam packaging is environmentally sound, our customers just don't feel good about it," Reisi said in a telephone interview from the company's suburban Oak Brook headquarters. "So we're changing."

Reisi said McDonald's will begin eliminating the sandwich containers which account for nearly 75 percent of the total foam used in the United States within 60 days. He said no timetable had been set for phasing it out at its restaurants abroad.

First to go will be the plastic foam sandwich boxes, which will be replaced by paper products manufactured in a new process that will preserve the food's temperature and freshness, Reisi said. He did not elaborate.

The company is still trying to determine suitable replacements for plastic cutlery and the plastic cups in which coffee is served, he said.

The paper wrappers McDonald's Senior Vice President Shelby Yastrow holds will replace the styrofoam behind him.

Reisi said the move would mean a significant reduction in the volume of packaging used by McDonald's.

A number of U.S. towns and cities have banned the use of polystyrene, saying it not only contributes to the growing shortage of landfill space, but also is made with chemicals that harm the atmosphere's protective ozone layer.

Audit: Agency bungled care of forest lands

WASHINGTON (AP) — Federal mismanagement of some of the nation's most productive timber lands has cost the government at least \$90 million since 1980, an Interior Department audit disclosed Thursday.

Mishandling of Bureau of Land Management forests in western Oregon is the result of financial shortfalls prompted by budget cutbacks, the department's Office of Inspector General said.

The report said the BLM lost \$90 million by failing to perform thinning, fertilization and other maintenance that resulted in fewer trees that could be cut. The BLM estimated it lost 94 million board feet of timber growth in the

fiscal years 1986-89 due to inadequate management. A board foot of pine, for example, is worth one inch.

In addition, the BLM has failed to acquire easements to 192,000 acres with 800 million board feet of mature timber valued at \$302 million.

Losses could total as much as \$1.7 billion over the next 60 to 80-year life cycles, the report said.

The audit of BLM forestry operations on 2.4 million acres across 18 Oregon counties criticized the agency for failing to explain the magnitude of the losses to Congress and the Office of Management and Budget.

Youths attack, kill homeless

NEW YORK (AP) — A dozen youths, some wearing Halloween masks, screamed "kick or treat" before attacking a homeless man with bats, pipes, knives and peat leavers, killing one man and maiming another Thursday.

Nine people were injured.

A 35-year-old homeless man, whose name was not released while police searched for relatives to notify, had his throat slashed and was pronounced dead at the scene, said a police spokeswoman, Officer Janice Swinyney.

The wooded area where the attack occurred "looked like a horror movie," it was in the dark, said a police officer.

The gang, which police said consisted of 40 to 120 people, crossed a footbridge on 402nd Street in Manhattan into Ward's Island on Halloween night.

Ward's Island is home to the Fire Department training academy, several psychiatric hospitals and a sewage disposal plant. It lies beneath the Triborough Bridge in the East River.

Injured on flight

SEATTLE (AP) — Seven passengers on a United Airlines flight from Hong Kong were injured Thursday when turbulence rocked the Boeing 747, an airline spokeswoman said.

The plane landed safely in Seattle shortly after noon. Paramedics met the plane and several passengers were transported to hospitals.

The injuries were minor, United spokeswoman Sarah Dornacker said.

Death toll in India rioting passes 200

AYODHYA, India — Religious riots sparked by Hindu fundamentalists' attempt to seize a Muslim mosque intensified Thursday, and the death toll in nine days of clashes rose to more than 200. News agencies and officials reported at least 31 people died across the country on Thursday. They were killed in battles between Hindus and Muslims or when police fired on mobs or when victims died in hospitals of injuries suffered in earlier riots.

Currency decree flusters Moscow shops

MOSCOW — President Mikhail S. Gorbachev's decree creating a new commercial exchange rate for the ruble created confusion and chaos Thursday in Moscow's hard-currency shops. "Closed for inventory," read a sign at the Swiss-Soviet joint venture shop Sadko. Gorbachev introduced the new rate, which took effect Thursday, with the publication on Oct. 26 of a presidential decree setting the value of the currency at 1.5 rubles to the dollar in commercial transactions, nearly 70 percent lower than the official rate.

Romanians take to streets over prices

BUCHAREST, Romania — Thousands of Romanians took to the streets Thursday to protest price increases that doubled or tripled prices on a wide range of goods. About 2,500 demonstrators occupied the main downtown square in Bucharest and about 10,000 people demonstrated in the central city of Brasov, demanding that a partial deregulation of prices be rescinded. The Commerce Ministry said the new price policy, which officially took effect Thursday morning, would double prices for clothes, public transport and furniture, among other items. The prices of footwear and leather goods were tripled, and the cost of some foodstuffs was to increase as well.

FBI head says bomb probe far from over

GLASGOW, Scotland — The director of the FBI indicated Thursday that the investigation into the bombing of Pan Am Flight 103 could continue for years. FBI Director William Sessions refused to comment on recent reports that the bombers may have penetrated a U.S. undercover operation, but said he was confident that the bombers would be brought before a court.

Iraq promises to free 4 American hostages

Iraq on Thursday promised to release four more American hostages soon and insisted it was treating foreign captives well.

President Bush denounced the hostage-holding and vowed to drive Saddam Hussein from Kuwait. "They have committed outrageous acts of barbarism," Bush said of Saddam's forces. "Barbarity — I don't believe that Adolf Hitler ever participated in anything of that nature."

Aboard the USS two Jinn, sailors and Marines paid sorrowful tribute to 10 comrades killed in a boiler-room accident. The deaths Tuesday were the biggest Navy casualties to date in Operation Desert Shield, the U.S. military deployment launched after Iraq's invasion of Kuwait three months ago.

Despite Iraqi assurances about the captives' welfare, letters smuggled from two American hostages and released by a U.S. official in Baghdad painted a picture of fear and desperation. In one, the author urged Americans not to forget their captive countrymen.

"I have been in the Iraqi cage system for almost two months. We are virtually prisoners in Iraq, wrote one of the unidentified Americans. The other wrote that he had been moved five times and was receiving no mail or messages. He said he had lost 35 pounds.

"Please do not forget the guest hostages," the first letter writer pleaded. Iraq calls the detained foreigners guests.

Bush, on a campaign swing in Burlington, Mass., made it clear that the plight of the hostages was much on his mind. He said the world community was "united in anger and outrage" at the treatment of the captives.

Thousands of foreigners were trapped in Iraq and Kuwait by the invasion, and since then Iraq has selectively freed hundreds of them. The larger mass release was that of hundreds of German nationals this week.

Western governments have denounced what they say is Saddam's use of the hostages to split the alliance opposing him.

The issue is indeed proving divisive. Britain's Foreign Office on Thursday criticized Germany over its former West German Chancellor Willy Brandt's plans to visit Baghdad to press for foreign hostages' freedom.

Brandt is going as a private citizen, but with the German government's support. The Bush administration responded angrily Thursday to an offer by Iraq a day earlier to allow holiday visits by relatives of hostages. State Department spokeswoman Margaret Tutwiler called it "shameless, cruel and insensitive."

Saddam, she said, "should not be discussing visits. He should be discussing the immediate release today of all those held against their will."

Bush, in his speech in Burlington, said he still hoped for a peaceful resolution, but insisted "there will be no compromise in the demand that Iraq relinquish Kuwait." The comments likening Saddam to Hitler were made at a subsequent stop. Presidential spokesman Martin Fitzwater said by using such strong rhetoric, the president was trying to prepare the American people for any eventuality.

"If we do have to take dramatic action, we want them to know why," Fitzwater said without elaborating.

United States will use reports of hostage maltreatment as a pretext to launch a military strike. Iraqi Information Minister Latif Nassim, announcing plans to free four sick and elderly Americans, denied the captives were being treated badly.

A U.S. Embassy spokesman welcomed word of the planned releases. The official Iraqi News Agency identified the four to be freed as Randall Tinnah, Dr. Abdul Kamal Raymond Galles and Michael James Itzow, and one whose age or home state was not given when they would be freed.

In the memorial ceremony about the amphibious assault ship USS Two Jinn, more than 1,000 American servicemen stood at attention on deck honoring the victims of Tuesday's accident. Some of the victims were killed instantly when the fueling stream burst out of a rupture pipe in the boiler room. Four others died of severe burns later.

Reporters and photographers were not permitted to attend the memorial service, but the Navy released a videotape of the event. Servicemen sang the Navy hymn, a 21-gun salute was fired, and bugles played taps.

Naval quarantine reduces ship traffic reaching Aqaba by 80%

ABOARD THE USS BRIDLE (AP) — On an average of three times a day, a hand-picked team of armed U.S. sailors boards merchant ships in the Red Sea that might be going to Iraq. U.S. Navy sailors get supplies to Iraq.

We're the Red Sea Highway Patrol," said gunner's mate William "Bo" Kitchens, 27, of Lakeland, Fla., a member of boarding team Alpha aboard the guided missile cutter USS Bridle.

"We should put a red and blue light atop the ship with a siren. It's more police work than anything else. We're stopping command from reaching its goal," Kitchens said after an interdiction was made.

The United Nations authorized the naval quarantine to punish Iraq for its Aug. 2 conquest of Kuwait. Nothing but medical supplies are allowed in, and no ships including tankers carrying Iraq's oilfield oil exports are permitted.

Much of the sea-going police work is done in the northern Red Sea, which includes traffic coming south from the Suez Canal and bound for the Jordanian port of Aqaba.

The port is a potential opening in the international effort because land routes from there lead across Jordan into Iraq.

What was one of the world's busiest shipping lanes just three months ago now has more warships than

merchant vessels.

"The shipping volume has been substantially throttled down. There's been an 80 percent reduction in the volume of shipping," said Rear Adm. Nick Cox, commander of Red Sea operations by the Maritime Interdiction Force.

"One of the warships plying the azure blue waters is the Bridle, part of the task force accompanying the aircraft carrier USS Saratoga.

"It's a total roadblock. This is a very effective blockade," said Capt. Louis Harlow, the Bridle's skipper.

"Nobody can leak through anything that moves, we've got them. The Iraqis have to be hurting."

A ring of warships is on patrol around the Arabian peninsula, which is bounded by the Red Sea, Arabian Sea and the Persian Gulf.

Since the embargo began in August, 3,107 ships have been intercepted, with 310 boarded. Almost all of the boardings have occurred in

the Red Sea.

Navy officials said 23 cargo ships have been diverted to other ports, including 10 ships bound for Aqaba or other ports because something was wrong with the ship.

For example, the Bridle refused passage to a ship carrying potassium nitrate, an ingredient for gun powder.

Others have been turned away because their manifests did not jibe with their cargo.

"A lot of Iraqi ships are at anchor in port. They're not even making the attempt," said Cmdr. Mark Merchat, public affairs officer for Navy Central Command.

His counterpart in the Gulf is Cmdr. Eric to and from Iraq is virtually a standstill.

In a typical operation, a U.S. warship or other units of the multinational armada enforcing the cancellation will board a merchant ship and seek its destination or cargo.

Anything bound for Aqaba is immediately under suspicion.

Other things that draw attention are ship's names that are painted over on ships that are sailing courses that differ from their announced destination.

Earlier this week, the Bridle stopped the Greek container ship Zim Venezia, which was headed for Eilat, Israel, right next door to Aqaba.

A 20-man boarding team carrying black flak jackets scurried down a rope ladder onto a 26-foot whale boat for a 1,500-yard trip to the merchant ship.

The boarding party, consisting of Navy and U.S. Coast Guard personnel, checked the ship's paperwork and crew before it was allowed to continue.

That interdiction lasted about four hours. Some can take 12 hours, or longer if cargo is checked.

Many are done at night, which makes the operation a bit dicier.

"It kind of gives you an eerie feeling at night, but it doesn't change our job any," said Coast Guard Ensign Chris Clark, 32, of Cape Cod, Mass.

Clark's last job was working interdiction against drug smugglers in the Caribbean, which he considered a more dangerous assignment than the work he's doing now.

"With drug interdiction, you never know what you're going to run across. There are more unknowns," Clark said. "Out here, we're on guard but we're not overly aggressive. We're firm but polite."

The Red Sea crew has its share of surprises. One time a Soviet ship was told to divert, and its captain radioed back: "I have your boarding party hostage."

When the boarding team gave him standard questions, the captain quickly replied: "That's a joke. Just kidding."

The Navy has nicknamed the Red Sea operation Tolo Station, after the line in "The Wizard of Oz" when Dorothy and her dog "Toto" are blown away from Kansas.

The Suez Canal is dubbed the Yellow Brick Road. Warships refer to sectors with codenames like Emerald City, Wizard of Oz, Wicked Witch and Tin Man.

Nashville sends its sounds to cheer troops in gulf

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — The spoken and sung messages of some of Nashville's top recording artists will be sent to American troops in Saudi Arabia within the next month, record company officials announced Wednesday.

Ten national record companies will ship up to 150,000 cassettes of country and gospel music to the

Middle East through the newly launched "Operation Desert Song" project, said Ken Harding of New Haven Records.

The effort appears to be the largest of its kind in the country, said Harding, who helped spearhead the project.

Two similar but smaller projects were recently launched in Los Angeles, he added.

Already, record companies have donated 120,000 tapes to the project.

and another 30,000 are expected by the end of November. The tapes will be sent to the Defense Department for distribution.

Organizers did not specifically name performers to be featured on the most tapes.

Instead, they said the cassette would represent every recording artist signed to a major record label in Nashville.

That would include performers such as Kenny Rogers, Dolly Parton,







Bliss church leader speaks out against books at PTO book fair

BLISS — A local church leader has spoken out against books sold in the Bliss Book Organizations's recent book fair.

The Rev. Paul Wagner of the Bliss Community Church said parents who attend his church and have children in Bliss schools expressed enough concern to warrant his visit to the book fair last night.

He said however that only about 1 percent of the books involved in the book fair were objectionable in his own mind.

The book fair was a PTO fund-raiser held in the auditorium at the Bliss Community Church. The parents who objected is called "Becky Becomes a Witch," a story of a 16-year-old girl who wants to be a

witch.

He also said many of the books at the fair were "TV figure carry-overs."

His presentation to the PTO met with a spirited discussion among the parents.

Several parents commented about the prevalence of eastern religious philosophies and mind control in the popular cartoon "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles."

Wagner nodded and told parents that those were the kind of things he was referring to.

"There's a pretty pervasive movement nationwide to bring into education different ideas," Wagner said. "For local schools are the best place to bring in new ideas. There's a real increase in mysticism, occult, new age, one-world, etc."

"Our kids have enough to face

without this negative influence," he said. "We're aware of what's out there and how much it's a part of the book fair and things like that."

He also mentioned a reported increase in occult practices and animal sacrifices in the Twin Falls area.

"We think we need to get isolated," Wagner said. "But when this many parents are able to spot books with bad influences, it sends up red flags."

Wagner asked the PTO members to look more closely at the books they check for the book fair, and to try to weed out the books with "negative influences."

One PTO member, Tillie Slane, said she didn't see anything wrong with the book fair selection.

"You might see things in a book that other people may not," she said. "You and taking your belief and say-

ing it's got to be my belief."

"Just because you can't see it, countered Wagner, "doesn't mean it's not there."

"If there's even one kid that it does make a difference to, that's one too many," he added.

PTO vice-president Carol Wood told Wagner that what boils down to is that parents are responsible for their own children.

"We as the PTO don't probably not censor the books, but we as parents can make people aware that it's there," she said.

"She added that "unacceptable" messages are sent to kids in subtle ways.

"These cartoons are feeding your children subtle messages," Wood said. "If you really start to watch for it, it's incredible how much of it there is."

Wood said Karate and Ninja cartoons, "until one looks deeper into them, discover they teach eastern religion."

Another PTO member, Nancy Couch, said she felt that her children benefit from all aspects of knowledge.

"As a parent, I don't mind my kids reading something, because then we can talk about it," she said. "I feel they need to have knowledge of everything."

Wagner and his congregation held a meeting several weeks ago to discuss the Bliss Community program labor included in Bliss schools. They objected to the "new-age humanism" program promoted, including the idea that children have control over their lives and that they should choose role models or "wizards" to help guide them.

Andrus is anything but caring. They say he has a long memory and carries a grudge.

"How do you fight that?" Andrus said. "I guess I have to conduct myself as always. I don't go but I don't get even. I don't expose myself to the same attack twice."

Republican state Sen. Laird-Nottingham said Andrus has the corporate support of the Boise Valley because he made the mistake of "if someone fails to support him, 'He'll make it difficult for that person in his administration."

For example, when the Potlatch Corp. in Lewiston did not support Andrus in 1986, the governor publicly criticized the corporation for displacing workers, Not said. But the company had to modernize or all jobs would be lost, Not said.

It wasn't until 1966, one large and smaller storefront were vacant in downtown Twin Falls. In 1988, two years after the Magic Valley Mall opened its regional shopping center north of Twin Falls, about 20 storefronts were vacant, including three large ones.

Now, a few are empty. The obituary hasn't been written, retailing is strong and evolving, and the area bills itself as the furniture store capital of Idaho.

Starting at noon today, merchants have invited the public to celebrate the downtown revitalization project. In 1970, the downtown area completed a construction project on the area's streets, planted trees and expanded parking lots.

The final piece to the downtown project's funding puzzle was put

The parking association, a group of downtown merchants, actually started the rejuvenation in the mid-1950s. They bought vacant land and buildings and installed parking meters.

"Parking was the key to the whole thing," Ashenbrenner said.

But when the 1970 construction was completed, the straight-as-an-arrow Main Avenue, which at one time had been U.S. Highway 30, between the city and the Magic Valley Mall, was a complete urban renewal project and the city wanted to close the project's office.

HUD didn't know how to, and even suggested finding something else to do so the office could stay open.

The didn't happen, and in the 1980s downtown merchants were looking at yet another way to promote the area's businesses and maintain streets, sidewalks and landscaping. The management of the district is the focus of disagreement between merchants on topics such as the event parking question.

But don't ask a downtown merchant if the area will wither away. The merchant's pride borders on defensive defiance brought on by love of Main Avenue.

"Every person has a heart," Ashenbrenner said. "And Twin Falls has a heart, and the heart of Twin Falls is still downtown."

PILT: Just compensation or double taxation?

TWIN FALLS — A proposed constitutional amendment on the general election ballot next Tuesday looks like a double-edged sword for the Idaho Department of Fish and Game to buy land for use as wildlife habitat and hunting and fishing areas.

But to others, it looks like double taxation.

House Joint Resolution 14, which amended the Idaho Constitution to provide that unimproved lands owned by Fish and Game would be subject to a payment in lieu of taxes, or PILT.

The annual fee, which would go from Fish and Game to counties, would not exceed the amount of the property tax at the time of acquisition by the department.

Other state and municipal agencies, schools and libraries would still be exempt from property tax.

Fish and Game supports the proposed amendment, which it feels would ease the financial relationship between the agency and counties, said Region 4 Supervisor Carl Nellis.

It would remove the main argument against the agency acquiring property removal from the county tax rolls.

But one opponent says PILT would mean those Idahoans who buy fish and game licenses and pay conservation law fines would be paying twice for the privilege of using the land — once as taxpayers and once as sportsmen.

"It looks like double taxation," said Les Hazen, president of the Idaho Wildlife Federation.

Some opponents may call it dou-

ble taxation, Nellis said, but the department does not operate with any tax money. All its funds come from the sale of hunting and fishing licenses and stamps and tags, he said.

Some argue that the money would be better spent on fish and wildlife or on other land acquisitions. But increased land purchases would generally benefit Idaho wildlife, Nellis said.

"In the proposition we'll be submitting to the governor (if the measure passes), the Fish and Game Department will pay taxes on unimproved land greater than 10 acres that we own," Nellis said.

The money would come from fines levied against fish and game law violators. In 1989, fines amounted to \$170,000.

The proceeds from fines now are split, with 5 percent going to the general fund, 22 1/2 percent to the district court system, 5 percent to search and rescue units and 67 1/2 percent going to the public school income fund.

Fish and Game's proposal would give 5 percent to search and rescue, 22 1/2 percent to the courts and 72 1/2 percent to about \$123,000 in 1989 — to payments in lieu of taxes.

It would essentially change the distribution of money to counties, which would get the money directly from Fish and Game instead of through the school funds from the state.

Fish and Game currently owns 116,000 acres, which is less than one-fourth of 1 percent of the land

area of the state, and it leases about 91,000 acres, Nellis said.

The maximum bill for taxes would be about \$300,000, or less than 1 percent of the department's annual budget. The year on land acquisitions is about \$600,000 a year on land acquisitions.

"We are supportive because we think it will greatly simplify our land purchases," Nellis said.

Most of the land the department is interested in is marginal agricultural property known as "wasteland," much of which makes good wildlife habitat, winter range, productive areas for upland birds and waterfowl and fishing and hunting access.

A constitutional amendment would be the only way to change the law without creating a dangerous precedent for other government agencies, state Sen. Laird Noh, R-Kimberly, said.

"It's a little bit of an additional user fee which goes toward supporting local government activity," said Noh, the chairman of the Senate Resources and Conservation Committee.

But Hazen said he feared it may be a measure to appease counties which oppose sale of land that the department has its eye on.

"I feel like they're shortsighted," Hazen said. "Once the amendment is passed the department will be stuck with it," he said.

The change shouldn't be done with a constitutional amendment,

Hazen said.

Rather the state could revert to a former plan under which fine money was paid to counties as a form of payment in lieu of taxes, Hazen said.

He also said that counties should realize that Fish and Game acquisitions would mean better hunting and fisherman access, which in turn would attract more tourists to the area.

"If people know the big story, I think they'll oppose it," Hazen said.

Some question fairness of NCAA drug program

BOSTON—The suspension of Boston College's star football player, Frank Fragara, for use of banned substances raised questions Thursday among some athletic directors about the NCAA's newly implemented drug testing program.

Fragara, Boston College's leading rusher, was suspended for the remainder of the season, effectively ending his career, after the NCAA ruled Monday night that he had tested positive for a banned substance during a recent sample of the player's urine.

Released from the school last week, Fragara had not tested positive for steroids, cocaine or marijuana. Coach Jack Dickel said Fragara had been suspended for taking a prescription medication not prescribed by team physicians, that he was on all the keeping records on the NCAA's list of banned substances.

According to NCAA director of sports sciences Frank Uray, the suspension of Fragara is a "divergent" action that "I think Division I-A and I-AA schools...are doing when something like this happens...it's not giving some other type of suspension or drug testing."

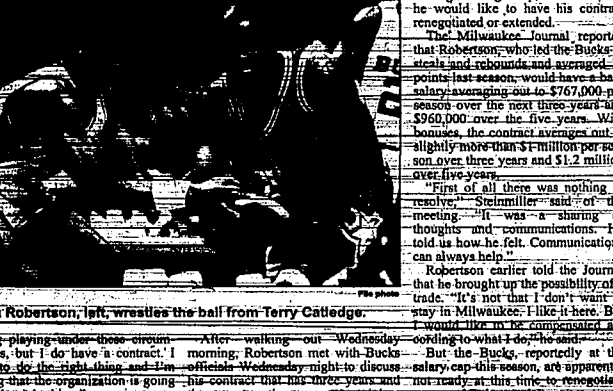

Idaho Falls official out following audit

IDAHO FALLS — Idaho Falls Parks and Recreation Division Director John Johnson was resigned after an audit revealed that he misappropriated an estimated \$12,343 of city and private money was unaccounted for.

But officials said Johnson was not accused of any crime. "He resigned this morning," Mayor Tom Campbell said Thursday. "He called in his staff and said he was resigning and said goodbye."

An audit by Rudd and Co. accountants said Johnson and his subordinates used improper accounting procedures in handling money collected for private sports leagues and player fees for the city.

Bible stories ordered out of school

COEUR D'ALENE — An elementary school teacher has been ordered to stop reading Bible stories to her second-grade class, Coeur d'Alene School District officials said.

"Reading passages from the Bible ends in the Coeur d'Alene school district," school district attorney Charles Dodson said Wednesday. "It violates the U.S. Constitution and the state constitution."

Superintendent Keith Tolzin, who issued the order, said he acted on a parent's complaint that a Bryan Elementary School teacher frequently read Bible stories to her second-grade class. The stories were included in a supplemental literature anthology, he said.

Tolzin declined to name the teacher or the parent who complained.

Biggest piece of Berlin Wall in Seattle

BOISE — The Northwest displays the largest American piece of the toppled Berlin Wall, and a reunified Germany wants to draw Northwest investors to the formerly walled-off eastern sector.

Germany's dealer brought the 4-by-40-foot, 200-pound, graffiti-covered chunk of the wall to Seattle to attract attention at an American Numismatics Association meeting.

It caught the eye of Hans von Beesten, Germany's consul general in Seattle. Now the wall is a Seattle Center attraction.

Von Beesten was in Boise Wednesday proclaiming the business opportunities in what used to be East Germany. He attended a seminar co-sponsored by the Idaho Department of Commerce and the Boise Chamber of Commerce.

Trial OK'd for escort service owner

COEUR D'ALENE — A magistrate ordered a Spokane, Wash. man bound over for trial on pimping charges stemming from an escort service he and his wife operated in Idaho and Washington.

First District Magistrate Peter Hutchinson on Wednesday ordered Don C. Gibbs to be held in the Kootenai County Jail in lieu of \$50,000 bond pending trial. Gibbs, 56, is charged with procurement for prostitution and conspiracy to commit procurement.

Former officer sues state over firing

NEZPERCE — A former Idaho State Police officer cited for using an artificial light to target what turned out to be a fake deer is suing the state for wrongful discharge and allegedly violating his civil rights.

Joseph P. Armen, who now is a patrolman with the Lewiston Police Department, filed suit in 2nd District Court in Nezperce against the state and Idaho Department of Law Enforcement Director Mack Richardson. The complaint asks for a jury trial and an unspecified amount in damages.

In his suit, he contends investigators denied him constitutional rights with a malicious intent to cause a deprivation of (Armen's) rights.

Honored teacher began in pharmacy

BOISE — Idaho's 1990 3rd "Teacher of the Year" was a pharmacy student in college when she decided to become a teacher.

"Everything I was doing did not have anything to do with what I love — literature and teaching," said Shirley Rau, the Nampa High School English Instructor who was surprised by the honor Wednesday.

"You can see by the amount of time she spends with the kids that she's doing her heart's work," Superintendent Steve Schmitz said. "Her rapport with the kids is remarkable. Schmitz said she has a convincing way of communicating with kids that she cares about them and that keeps them coming back."

School's religious activity won't halt funding

GRANVILLE (AP) — The state schools superintendent says he will not withhold funds from Grangeville-area Joint School District 241 for allowing prayer and Golden Bibles in the classroom.

The procedure for doing so is not clear, Jerry Evans said Wednesday, and the language of the Idaho Constitution allows some room for interpretation on the subjects.

Evans made the statements in response to a Lewiston Morning Tribune editorial calling for the tribe to be withheld.

District 241 includes Grangeville, Kooakia, Powell, Elk City, Riggs and White Bird.

District trustees have voted to continue with prayers at high school graduations and to allow the Golden Bibles to be read in the classroom. The trustees said they will allow the practices until ordered by a court to stop.

One Grangeville woman objected to the practice. The American Civil Liberties Union's Jack Van Valkenburg said it had not received any complaints from parents in the week he considers mounting a challenge to a possible intermingling of church and state.

Evans said he is unsure about the process of withholding state money from schools that violate the state

constitution, but it probably would involve a hearing to determine whether the district was in violation. "In the absence of that, there isn't anything to be done about it," the school district's money, Evans said.

He also added he doesn't know how many school districts in Idaho still religious practices.

"There isn't any kind of a report, I don't recall seeing anything," Evans said. "Do you comply with every requirement in the constitution? If not, please check each item you do not comply with," Evans said.

There is "a great deal of authority given to local school

boards, and the trustees are sworn to follow the law," Evans said.

The Idaho Constitution is even more stringent on the issue than the U.S. Constitution. But it does not talk specifically about prayer said at commencement exercises, Evans said. It also lacks guidelines about the distribution of religious books by an organization outside the employ of the school district, he said.

"As I understand it, those folks (the Golden Bibles) are not employees of the district," Evans said.

Elaine Eberharter-Maki, deputy attorney general with the Idaho Department of Education, agreed with Evans.

Supreme Court stays execution pending hearing

WASHINGTON (AP) — The U.S. Supreme Court on Thursday stayed the execution of Canyon County murderer Federico Paz pending a hearing on his petition for federal review of his conviction and sentence.

The order came less than 24 hours before Paz was scheduled to die by lethal injection.

No date was set for the hearing, and public defender Van Bishop said he would file a petition outlining challenges to the government's case within the next two months.

The high court order came two days after the Idaho Supreme Court refused to stay the execution pending a ruling from the federal bench on whether the case would be reviewed.

Paz, 31, of Notus, was sentenced to die by 3rd District Judge Dennis Goff for the first-degree murder of Jerry Bright, 39, in a Caldwell cafe in August 1987.

State warns against 'living will' sales

BOISE (AP) — Attorney General Jim Jones is urging all Idahoans — especially senior citizens — to be wary of businesses selling "living will" kits.

The legal documents recognized by Idaho's Natural Death Act give adults a way of ensuring their wishes are known "relating to the rendering of their medical care, including the decision to have life sustaining procedures withheld or withdrawn."

Living wills, which have become increasingly popular since last summer's U.S. Supreme Court decision on individuals' right to die, pertain only to medical care and are not used for the disposition of property after a person's death.

Jones said his office's consumer protection unit has found some businesses taking advantage of that situation.

He said the latest problem involves people selling and assisting consumers with the filling out of living wills at inflated prices.

"Unfortunately, most of these unscrupulous individuals are playing upon people's emotions, especially the elderly, to get them to purchase a document which they could obtain for only the cost of an envelope and postage from the Idaho Office on Aging."

Arlene Davidson, state ombudsman for the elderly, has prepared a do-it-yourself living will packet including a copy of a living will and a "durable power of attorney for health care," which Jones called essential.

Today's pedantic North had mixed feelings about losing the vulnerable game. On the one hand he was out a few nickels; on the other, he got an opportunity to give his partner a long lecture.

South ruffed the second heart, drew trumps and cashed dummy's top clubs. He ruffed a club in hopes of a 3-3 break, but when he saw that he couldn't establish and run the clubs, he fell back on the spade suit.

There was no 3-3 break there either, and South was forced to lose two spades and a heart for one down.

North was ready with his lecture. "Your choice of plays gave you a reasonable shot at success, however, you missed a much better chance. Since games and rubbers were worth 600 points (not counting honors), you could have easily afforded a possible waste of 20 points to improve your chances appreciably."

After drawing trumps, instead of cashing top high clubs and ruffing a third, you should have ducked the invitational bid; partner should have a four-card spade suit, and cash the top clubs, discarding a spade. A club ruff establishes dummy's fifth club for a second duck, and the defenders get only a heart and a club.










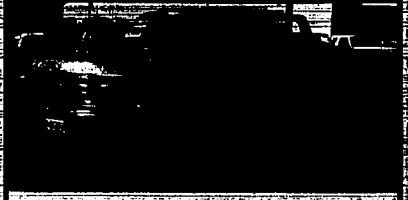

Two Kimberly Elementary School students made the rounds among the members of the Harvest Moon Dance Company, ably offering each woman a piece of paper and pen.

The dancers were tickled to oblige, even though they weren't necessarily looking for fame and fortune when they joined forces this fall to begin the Wood River Valley's newest dance company.

Mostly, they were just looking for an opportunity to perform.

"That's the bottom line," said Beth Chiodo, who co-directs Harvest Moon with deLisser. "One of the main reasons we wanted to have the company is so we could dance."

Harvest Moon will make its official debut this weekend in Ketchum, with a Twin Falls performance set Dec. 15. But students at Kimberly Elementary got a sneak preview of the group this week at an assembly coordinated by company member and well-known Twin Falls

dance instructor Lori Head.

Their first piece, "Sleepers" was choreographed by Carl Rowe of the Idaho Dance Theatre in Boise and danced to the chanting of a Bulgarian women's choir.

The women danced fluidly on the slippery gymnasium floor, their light white tunics flowing about them. The children politely watched the modern dance, its movements beautiful but somewhat abstract.

The kids were more excited by the company's second piece, a jazz-inspired number called "Fast Tracks." With its punning, swirling and pulsating score by Hiram Bullock, it was more akin to what youngsters see on MTV.

They clapped loudly to the beat as the dancers — dressed in tiger-print undies — pranced to choreography by Maureen Janison of Chicago's XSight Dance Company.

Chiodo and deLisser said Harvest Moon was formed when the two realized this summer that — for the first time in many years — there were enough professional dancers in the Sun Valley area to form a resident company. The last ensemble, headed by the Rows and Harlie-

Neely, became defunct several years ago.

TV series derived from movies don't usually excel

It's more than a month into the new season, and Kevin Meany, television's "Uncle Buck" has yet to see John Candy as the big screen's "Uncle Buck."

Until he's certain that his show will live to see another season on CBS, Meany will stay away from the film. He says he wants audiences to keep the roles separate, and if he saw the film he might adopt some of Candy's characteristics.

Still, Meany has his work cut out converting a popular movie character into a popular television presence. And he has plenty of company this season.

Six shows based on feature films premiered on the networks this fall: three animated Saturday morning series.

The "Wizard of Oz" Bill and Ted's Excellent Adventure" and the series raise on the half-hour promotor from syndication, "Looney Tunes/Ninja Turtles" and three prime-time comedies — "Uncle Buck," "Ferris Bueller" and "Parenthood."

And still more are set for mid-season, including "Big," "Baby Talk" from "Looney Tunes" and "The Believer" and "I'm Gonna Get You Sucka." A How many of the new shows will be around for a second season is anybody's

guess. The latest Nielsen ratings don't look promising for the prime-time bunch.

Truth is, television series spawned from movies have a pretty dismal track record.

Of current comedy programs for NBC, "More than half of the 58 movie-to-TV conversions since the late '40s failed to make it beyond the first season. Only six have lasted five years or more."

Most television series fall, regardless of their origin, said Ted Frank, vice president of current comedy programs for NBC. "In television, everything is a long shot. This is a high-risk business," he said.

Sure, movies bring a built-in familiarity.

With a fraction of the other network's money, stars and shows, Fox jumped into the top 10 last season with two programs, one about dysfunctional families — "The Simpsons" and "Married... With Children."

"Everybody in the press blew up big for the last four or five months," says Fox president Leslie Kellner. "Now it's time for them to take the air out of their own noses."

Kellner maintains that Fox is doing no worse in the opening weeks of this season than it did in the three previous premieres. "We've almost always had the bottom 10 shows in the Nielsen," he says. "Every year, Fox has found that its (rating) shares have dipped a bit. Then in October and November, our shares have grown."

'Memphis Belle' has poignant view of war

At a time when the helicopter crews are going down in the Middle East, the stirring scenes of the last flight of a B-17 flying over Europe in "Memphis Belle" has become an unusual force and poignancy.

World War II was the last popular conflict for America, but sending boys in their teens or barely out of their twenties to fight overseas in the front still seems tragic, wrong. The agonies of watching the last flight over Germany of the Memphis Belle is diminished by knowing the historical fact that the legendary bomber successfully completed its 25th mission on May 17, 1945, in England, by British film makers and starting young American airmen's carries some dead along with its cargo of excitement.

Scottish comic needs TV to become known

He has toured the world. Packed concert halls from Sydney, Australia, to New York City, where he has twice sold out Carnegie Hall. He's a big star in England, and plays with members of the Royal Family. He's made albums, seven of them gold. And here in the United States, he has been making audiences laugh for the last 17 years.

Is it any wonder Billy Connolly, the Scottish comedian, is one of the Oxford-educated, teacher Billy MacGregor on ABC's "Head of the Class" looked shocked when his agent urged him to do television to become known.

"Nobody knows me here," he said. "Can you imagine it?" says Connolly in his delightful Scottish accent. "I did all these things for 25 years, I'm considered very successful, and I have to go on the telly to become known? I never asked anybody for a job on television. It was the last thing I ever wanted to do."

It was Michael Elias, an executive producer on the series, who met me at a dinner in London and told me he was familiar with my work.

"They wanted more energy on the series, to change its direction. Howard Rosenberg, whom I replaced, is a more technical actor than I am. I'm a comedian. He's an actor. When in doubt, I fall back on energy. Fortunately, it has worked so far."

The comedian has a theory about why it's necessary to do TV in the U.S. "It's the sheer size of the country," he reasons. "In England, you play a club and word gets around you're good and everyone comes to see you. Suddenly you're known all over the country. In Scotland, you play a club and the word doesn't reach Philadelphia and you've entertained more people than you did in Australia. It's the shape of America that makes it important."

Now that he's done TV, he's glad. He says the "Head of the Class" cast has been "incredibly nice. By now I should be disliking someone, but it hasn't happened."

He keeps his Scottish accent for a very good reason. Says he: "When you try to change it, you sound like a good imitation of me because of my accent."

But his beard had to be sacrificed, not for the series but for his latest film, "The Big Guy," starring Liam Neeson, which was made in Scotland.

"When I shaved my beard off, after 27 years, I didn't know myself. I was fat in the face and had this post-agenic look about me. I've since lost some weight and have gotten down to one chin."

Connolly doesn't drink and is a vegetarian — but don't call him a reformer or zealot.

"I hate it when people try to reform others. I had the time of my life when I was drinking," he says, chuckling. "I was married to my good wife."

"Saturday Night Live" (film) Pamela (Stephenson), we were having babies. I was in a band and was successful. It was no problem to me. But when it stopped being fun I stopped drinking."


Good natured and sharp-witted, he touches on every subject from Margaret Thatcher ("an incredibly stupid woman") to the class structure in England ("a curse"). But he's friend-

ly with the Royal Family, likes standing. I've always been for the Prince Charles, Princess Anna, and Fergie, the Duchess of York. In fact, he danced all night at her wedding to Prince Andrew.

"I was very proud to be invited," he said. "But a lot of people disagreed with me because of my lunatic work for one."

I've always been for the working class and they saw it as changing sides. I'm incapable of doing that. I'm not a monarchist. I feel very much like Mark Twain, who said if there was a country without a monarch and they had a vote only lunatics would vote for one.

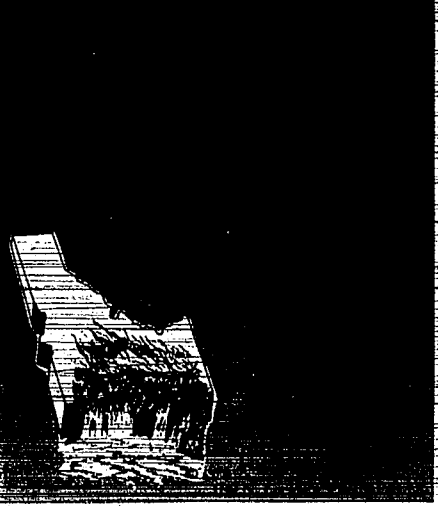

Thank you! Let's have a round. We'd like to propose a toast to a television series that's been with us for more than eight years now.

This is a television series that's approved some changes that could well have meant the end for a lesser show.

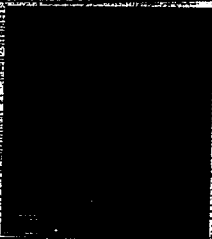

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A rare interview with author Salman Rushdie made CBS' "60 Minutes" the most watched show on television last week, but NBC won the network ratings race with another photo finish.

Separated by only one-tenth of a ratings point, the three networks were led by NBC with a 12.5 rating, followed by ABC with 12.4 and CBS with 12.3, according to A.C. Nielsen Co. figures released Tuesday.

An interview by "60 Minutes" correspondent Mike Wallace with Rushdie, who has lived in hiding since his novel "The Satanic Verses" caused some Moslem leaders to issue a death sentence against him, helped the Sunday news magazine capture the No. 1 spot for the first time in the 6-week-old fall season.

NBC's "Cheers," which had occupied the top ranking for most of the new season, fell to second place.

The top 10 was again dominated by longstanding hits. In a season with the most new shows in television history, the highest-rated original fall program was "America's Funniest People" — a spinoff of ABC's hugely successful "America's Funniest Home Videos"

and Fox Broadcasting Co., the three major broadcasters are barely able to distinguish themselves from one another in the ratings.

Laura's killer will be revealed — really

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Peaks freaks rejoice. On Nov. 10, the identity of "Bob" will be revealed, thereby finally unveiling the killer of teen queen Laura Palmer.

Or so said ABC Entertainment President Bob Iger last Thursday.

ABC has promised before to identify the murderer in its downright confusing "Twin Peaks" series.

So far, the network hasn't made good on that promise.

The network's programming chief talked about his troubled series during an informal news conference at the network's West Coast headquarters.

Asked if "Twin Peaks" was ever going to resolve the 6-month-old

Palmer murder, Iger replied that episodes this season made it very clear to viewers that "Bob" is the killer.

Problem is, it's entirely unclear just who or what "Bob" is. A demon? A person? A distant cousin of Freddy Krueger?

"On November 10th, you will know who Bob is," Iger said.

He also discussed another much-hyped but little-watched show on his network: "Cop Rock." The poorly rated new series about police officers who burst into song is rumored to be inches away from the programmer's ax. Iger would not say whether the show would be canceled.

"We reserve the right to move it,

change it, pull it or leave it on," Iger said.

He admitted viewers found the musical segments "firing" and that the network had discussed reducing the number of songs. Steven Bochco, the show's creator, also developed the hit "T.A. Love" and "Hill Street Blues."

Iger said he has adopted a patient, wait-and-see attitude about the 5-week-old hit series and probably would not announce any cancellations until next year.

This fall's introduction of a record 35 series on the big three networks and Fox Broadcasting has created "mass chaos" among viewers and overwhelmed them with a volume of choices, Iger said.

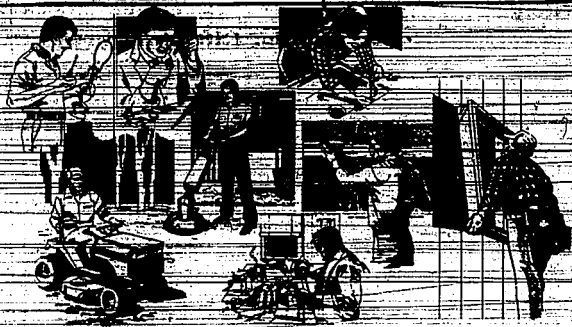
