

If it is an infection-based outbreak, the students could, have eaten—the fainted food up to three days before becoming sick, Simon said.

There are so many dorms involved," said Dr. Ingrid Hagan, Wardenburg's chief of staff. "I myself saw several-patients that didn't cat in the dorms, they ate off campus."





Research linking genetic defect to aneurysms is 'breakthrough'

PHILADELPHIA (AP) Researchers have linked a genetic defect to aortic aneurysms, a finding that an outside researcher termed a major breakthrough against the district order, which kills an estimated 15,000 Americans a year.

The Thomas lefferson University researchers also reported they developed a saliva test to detect the genetic mutation, first found in a former Air Force captain. The test can be used to detailing the woman's relatives at risk for the disease.

"Our study proves for the first time that there is a genetic cause for aortic ancuryanis in people who do not have any other signs of a genetic disease," said Dr. Darwin Prockep-

In 1988, physicians discovered while examining Capt Michele Hegler of Houston that several members of her family had died from ruptured aortic aneutysms. An aneutysm is a balloon-like swelling indicating a weak spot in the aorta, the body's largest blood vessel.


